Company a bigger pull than dining

TWIN FALLS — There was plenty of free food to be thankful for Thursday, but many Thanksgiving dinners at St. Edward's Parish Hall said they were just glad to have some company.

"I get tired of eating by myself," Doris Stark of Twin Falls said. She had lots of company as roughly 120 people were served in the first hour with more arriving all the time.

"I really didn't think there would be this many people here," Stark said.

But no matter how many showed up, volunteer crews were sure to have enough food. More than 20 turkeys and oodles of cranberry sauce, mashed potatoes and gravy, stuffing, vegetables and pumpkin pie were donated by local businesses and individuals.

The free meal fed not only those who could not afford the traditional holiday spread, but also those who wanted to return to the community roots of Thanksgiving.

"This is the way Thanksgiving was originally celebrated," said Paula Mangini, who joined her husband, Ted, and four-year-old daughter Paulese, for dinner at the parish hall.

The president eats with the troops

IN EASTERN SAUDI ARABIA — President Bush shared Thanksgiving dinner with U.S. troops at a desert outpost 65 miles from occupied Kuwait and cautioned that Saddam Hussein was developing a dangerous nuclear capability.

"He's never possessed a weapon he didn't use," Bush said.

On a uniquely American holiday, Bush apologized for sending the soldiers so far from home and praised them — 230,000 strong — as "the ones doing the heavy lifting" for his policy to reverse Iraq's invasion of Kuwait.

During three separate stops, Bush urged U.S. and allied forces to remain strong against Iraq and said, "More and more, your mission is marked by a real sense of urgency."

"We won't pull punches. We are not here on some exercise. And we're not walking away until our mission is done, until the invaders are out of Kuwait," he said, producing hoops of approval when he added, "And that may well be where you come in."

Meanwhile, Saddam, in a clear challenge to Bush, made an inspection tour of occupied Kuwait Thursday and said he would fight to "unscend the evil haphschemers" in the event of a U.S. scaled offensive.

Bush, his wife Barbara and the four top congressional leaders ate two Thanksgiving dinners with troops and attended worship services on a ship in the Persian Gulf. Bush also spoke to a combination of American, British, Saudi and Kuwait troops at an air base in Dhahran.

Bush was greeted enthusiastically by the forces he had sent there to confront Iraq, especially at the distant outpost, but some expressed frustrations with the waiting game in the desert.

"Let's go get him (Saddam) now so we can go home," Army Spec. 4 Gwendolyn Page shouted at Bush at Dhahran.

Army Reservist Capt. Don Shiarra, a financial planner from Salem, Ore., who had to leave his business to serve here, expressed frustration that Bush had just extended his call up for a second 90-day period.

"We'll stay until the job's done, but let's just get going. I think it's time to make a statement," he told a reporter.

At his final Saudi stop of the day, Bush climbed into a tanker at this Marine outpost as the sun set and chatted with those on duty there. Later he discussed his day with reporters, saying he understood that many of the troops here had sent to the Persian Gulf are expressing some anxiety and frustration.

"I think the waiting is a difficult part of this," Bush said. "But I sense a certain resolve on their part. They want to do something and they want to do it fast, and get it over."

"It was a very emotional day," Bush said. "These are the ones doing the heavy lifting. God bless them all."

A contingent of Britain's famed Desert Rats served as a reminder to Bush that his strongest ally, Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, had announced her resignation just hours earlier in London.

Earlier, Bush and his fleet of helicopters flew over miles of trackless sands and out into the Persian Gulf, to land, one helicopter at a time, on the USS Nassau, a 820-foot-long helicopter assault ship.

Aides said he came to the ship, which is in international waters, for the service because religious observances are illegal in Saudi Arabia.

Under cloudless skies and a hot sun, the Bushes, top aides and their congressional guests sat in the front row.

All manner of events make up day

Thanksgiving 1990 was a day for some to run a grueling marathon while most of us sat down and ate for much of the day.

Many wolfed down turkey but a few fed the birds a treat. Restaurants fed the homeless for free. And Bart Simpson barged down Broadway.

And in the midst of the good times and celebration, it was a day of tears for some whose loved ones were in the Middle East.

Television gave most of the country an armchair view of the 64th Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York with its marching bands, floats and helium-filled cartoon character balloons.

There were also people lined the streets to watch the parade with many of the youngsters cheering a huge figure of underachiever Bart Simpson.

Things didn't go quite so smoothly in Detroit, where a 30-foot-long \$15,000 helium balloon of "Chilly Willy," the penguin broke away late Wednesday and floated away.

The Coast Guard recovered it later in Lake St. Clair, 45 miles north.

Thousands of people also lined downtown streets in Philadelphia to watch bands, floats, giant balloons and more than 5,000 marchers under a warm clear sky.

"There's a lot of good spirit here plus a perfect day for a parade," said Bill McColgan, 32, of Levittown, Pa.

Kermit the Frog returned to the New York parade in honor of Muppet creator Jim Henson, who died this year. "Kermit makes me sad," said New Yorker Peter Oppald, 27, who test his smile when the green frog was tagged into view.

At the end of the parade, about 20 AIDS activists unfurled banners that read:

"4,752 AIDS Deaths 'till Christmas" and "Ask Santa Claus for National Health Care."

While people stood on the curb to watch the parade, others put their feet up in front of the tube, about 30,000 people donned sweatshirts and thundered off on the Atlanta-Track-Club's annual 26.2-mile marathon. The route they followed is the one recommended for marathon events when Atlanta is host to the 1996 Summer Olympics.

Thanksgiving was a little sadder in coastal Georgia, where families of soldiers sent to the Persian Gulf with the 24th Infantry Division kept each other company.

"My husband called last night. It was fantastic," said Brenda Mustoe of Savannah, whose husband, Victor, is a chief

Thatcher resigns; party torn

LONDON — Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher called it quits Thursday.

She left her nation transformed by 11 1/2 years of Thatcherism and her party torn by a bitter and potentially destructive struggle for succession.

The "Iron Lady" informed her Cabinet of her decision to resign the morning after she declared she would "fight on" to a second round of the leadership election against former Defense Minister Michael Heseltine.

"She told us of her decision and then got on with business," said Transport Secretary Cecil Parkinson. At the same Cabinet meeting, she decided to commit 14,000 more British troops to the Persian Gulf.

As flowers and tributes poured into the official residence at 10 Downing Street, she publicly defended her decision to stand against a motion of no-confidence introduced by Labor Party leader Neil Kinnock.

"I'm enjoying this!" she enjoyed the House of Commons, full to overflowing for a sometimes rude, sometimes sentimental debate. A "tired-looking" Mrs. Thatcher was some-

times hoarse and frequently coughed.

The motion of censure, which could have brought down the government, was resoundingly defeated by a 170-vote majority in the 650-seat House late Thursday, with no Tory defections.

No longer shackled by loyalty, Foreign Secretary Douglas Hurd and treasury chief John Major earlier Thursday quickly jumped into the leadership contest, which will be settled next week. Thursday was the deadline for nominations.

After succeeding Laborite James Callaghan as prime minister in 1979, Mrs. Thatcher relentlessly promoted capitalism in Britain. She sold many nationalized industries to private shareholders, including British Steel and British Airways, crushed the power of labor unions and cut tax rates.

By directing a risky but successful war against Argentina in the Falklands in 1982 and through her close relationship with President Ronald Reagan, she was widely credited with restoring Britain's self-image as a world power.

At home, the party rebellion had been building for years, but news that Margaret Thatcher walked away from a fight surprised the world.

"I thought she'd duke it out," a U.S. Marine in Saudi Arabia remarked to President Bush. "So did I," the president said.

Mrs. Thatcher, 65, was Europe's longest-serving prime minister in this century, the only one to win three consecutive elections, for 15 years, unchallenged leader of the Conservative Party.

The "Iron Lady" tag was an unintended tribute from Moscow, from the days in the 1970s when she was opposition leader and an enthusiastic Cold Warrior.

She decided to resign two days after joining 33 other world leaders in signing the Cold War, marking the formal end of the Cold War.

Until the Conservatives choose their new leader, Mrs. Thatcher is still prime minister.

Hundreds recall Kennedy's death

DALLAS — Hundreds of people spent part of Thanksgiving day remembering President Kennedy with a visit to the downtown building where investigators say Lee Harvey Oswald fired the shots that killed him 27 years ago.

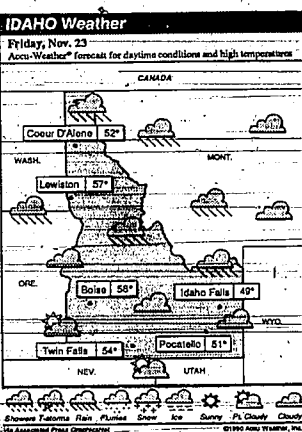
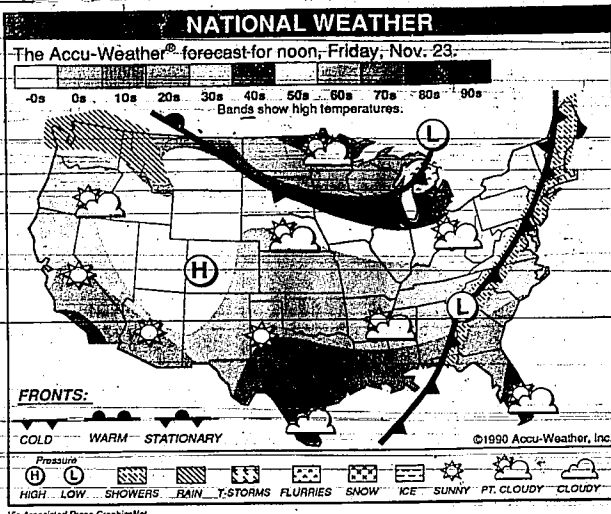
By the end of the day, more than 700 people visited the Texas School Book Depository exhibit on Kennedy's assassination, said exhibit director Bob Hays.

The exhibit is open every day of the year except Christmas.

The exhibit opened on President's Day, 1989, on the sixth floor of the building where investigators say Oswald packed his boxes and ate his lunch on Nov. 22, 1963, waiting for the presidential motorcade to pass by.

The exhibit features more than 400 photographs and a narrative detailing Kennedy's life and death. It mentions controversies over the accuracy of official reports on the assassination and speculation about whether Oswald had conspirators.

Cloudy skies and scattered showers continued over the panhandle Thursday afternoon, while variable clouds moved across the south.

Rain falls across Northwest, eastern half of nation

Rain fell from Texas to New York in advance of a strong cold front Thursday while the soaked Northwest got more rain and snow.

At midday the cold front extended across north-central Ohio, south-central Indiana, southeastern Missouri and south-central Oklahoma to central Texas.

Ahead of the cold front, rain extended from western New York state to central Arkansas.

Rain and occasional thunderstorms reached across southern Arkansas, northern Louisiana, southeastern Oklahoma and from northeastern Texas to the Texas Big Bend region.

In the Northwest, rain fell over western Montana, the Idaho Panhandle, Washington and northwestern Oregon, with snow at higher elevations. Snow also fell in the mountains of west-central Wyoming.

Washington's Snoqualmie Pass got 2.5 inches of rain from 3 a.m. Wednesday to 3 a.m. Thursday, enough to melt snow on the road over the pass. Warm rain also melted 3 inches of snow cover at Mullan, Idaho, during the morning.

Flood warnings were posted for sections of rivers in western Washington.

High wind blew across the Northwest and northern Rockies, with gusts during the morning to 92 mph at Rustle, Colo.; 80 in Wyoming near Laramie, Cheyenne and Wheatland.

In eastern Washington, several highways were closed by wind and blowing dust, and trees were downed by high wind near Spokane and at Rockford, Idaho.

Elsewhere, showers were scattered over southern Florida, and light rain fell over east-central Minnesota.

Tod is the secretary for the Holiday Council, a group of local churches that joined with the Salvation Army to put on dinner.

"We skipped the big family do in Mountain Home to be here," Pruitt said. "This is actually more of a traditional Thanksgiving, when the whole community gathers together."

Several people who frequent the kitchen operated by the Catholic Church every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 6 p.m. were on hand for Thanksgiving dinner, but some were out of town with family members, said Evelyn LeClair, who was in the kitchen preparing menu turkey.

"This is kinda fun," said 8-year-old Kevin News, who was taking a break from his kitchen duties for a holiday meal.

"Our parents said we could come along if we wanted to," said Calvin Whitley, 15. "Last year we just stayed home. This is better."

This is the first year since a large number of churches and civic organizations have gotten together to provide a Thanksgiving meal. Evelyn LeClair said, noting that only 19 people showed up at the parish hall for the 1989 dinner.

The apparent success of Thursday's dinner will carry beyond Thanksgiving. The inevitable leftovers will go to the St. Edward's soup kitchen, Ted Mangini said.

And, added Lloyd LeClair, "if this works, we're going to try it again at Christmas."

How Britain Will Get a New Leader

Margaret Thatcher will remain prime minister of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland until the governing Conservative Party chooses a new leader next week. Here's a look at how the leadership change will work.

SELECTING A PRIME MINISTER

Citizens of the United Kingdom do not vote for the prime minister, who is the head of government. They vote for a local Member of Parliament. The leader of the party with a majority in the 650-seat House of Commons is the prime minister.

RULES FOR ELECTION

Each party has its own rules for electing a leader. The Conservative Party, which has a 98-seat majority in the Commons, will choose its new leader by a secret ballot on Tuesday; if no candidate wins a majority, there will be a final ballot on Thursday.

HANDING OVER POWER

When the Conservative Party chooses a new leader, Mrs. Thatcher will submit her resignation to Queen Elizabeth II. The party's new leader would meet the monarch soon afterward to be confirmed as prime minister, probably within an hour.

TERMS OF OFFICE

Parties are elected to govern for a maximum of five years, but a British prime minister can call a general election at any time. The present government's term runs out in mid-1992.

Thatcher Career Highlights

Margaret Thatcher stepped down Thursday as Britain's Prime Minister ending over 11 years of power, after members of her Cabinet warned her she would lose a second round of the Conservative Party's leadership election next week.

FEB. 11, 1975
Defeats Heath in contest for leadership of the Conservative Party; Thatcher's opposition.

APRIL 2, 1982
Argentine Forces Invade the Falkland Islands, a British colony. Britain sends a naval task force and reclaims the islands June 14 after the Argentines surrender.

JULY 8, 1982
Begins second term as prime minister.

OCT. 12, 1984
Mrs. Thatcher escapes injury as Irish Republican Army bombs her hotel in Brighton during the Conservative Party conference. Five people are killed.

JAN. 6, 1986
Defense Secretary Michael Heseltine resigns from Cabinet in dispute over American aid to takeover of Westinghouse PWR helicopter manufacturer.

JUNE 11, 1987
Becomes the only prime minister of the 20th century to win three elections consecutively.

OCT. 26, 1989
Nigel Lawson, Chancellor of the Exchequer, resigns over the monetary policy.



MAY 4, 1979
Becomes prime minister when Conservatives win parliamentary majority in general election.

MARCH 12, 1984
The National Union of Mineworkers begins the longest and most violent strike in British history and a watershed in Mrs. Thatcher's effort to crush union power. Miners vote 61 weeks later to return to work without a settlement.

November	1990	THURSDAY, NOV. 23 Defeats Prime Minister Sir Geoffrey Howe, the last of Thatcher's original Cabinet, resigns over her stance toward European union.

Thanksgiving weekend signals start of uneasy Christmas season

NEW YORK (AP) — When the turkey is gone and the football games are over, Americans move on to another Thanksgiving weekend tradition: hitting the stores Friday for the unofficial start of the Christmas shopping season.

But retailers don't expect business to boom, not with the flagging economy and the Middle East crisis. Many shoppers are expected to browse, not buy, this weekend.

Phil Sawyer, manager of a J.C. Penney branch in Richmond, Va., predicted sales would slack off after a burst of buying on Friday, similar to the business his store had during a previous economic slowdown.

In years past, the Thanksgiving weekend was the high point of the season. Retailers had their biggest three-day take that weekend, and it set the tone for the rest of the Christmas period.

In recent years, as more women joined the work force, consumers have been shopping later and later, and the Thanksgiving weekend lost some of its significance. It's the last

10 days before Christmas that matter the most now.

But this year, the Thanksgiving weekend has added importance because it will help determine retailers' strategy for the rest of the season. Christmas is crucial for stores, because they generally make half their annual profits at this time.

Retailers are uneasy about the season because sales, already weakened this year by the faltering economy, fell off sharply after the Aug. 2 Iraqi invasion of Kuwait. Consumers were unsettled by all the uncertainty and also were forced to pay more for gasoline and heating oil.

Storekeepers don't expect a dramatic about-face, although consumers tend to spend more during the holidays. "We're not living on hope, we're living with reality," J.C. Penney Co. Chairman William R. Howell said in an interview.

Some early shoppers said they were planning a frugal Christmas. "I'm sending nice cards for the people I used to buy small gifts for," said Lynn Epperson, who was brows-

ing through a store in Williamsburg, Va., on Tuesday. Her sister, Patricia Fopiano, said she wasn't dropping anyone from her list but planned to spend less on each gift this year.

It's hard to gauge from pre-Thanksgiving business how well retailers will do. Last weekend, several department stores in the suburbs north of New York City had few shoppers, while a mall in Woodbridge, N.J., was jammed.

Retailers' biggest hope this season is to avoid the steep markdowns that decimated earnings last Christmas. Many companies competing with the department stores owned by Campeau Corp. were forced to slash prices after Caroupeau's units, in a futile attempt at staying out of bankruptcy court, took heavy markdowns to bring in sales.

The retailers were so frantic to get sales last year, they were throwing stuff out the door," recalled Jeffrey Edelman, a retail industry analyst with Barclays & Zoete Wedd Inc. Christmas 1989 was devastating for some retailers, most notably R.H.

Macy & Co. Macy's was among those forced to take markdowns and ended up with a \$39 million loss in the second quarter of its fiscal year.

Analysts believe there will be some markdowns this year, but just how severe the price cuts will be depends on how the season progresses.

Edward Johnson, an analyst with Prudential-Bache, said stores began taking markdowns a few weeks ago, but they're still not as bad as they were last year. It's a toss of the coin whether they will get beyond that point," he said, adding that if this weekend goes poorly, retailers may begin their markdowns early in hopes of increasing sales.

Edelman said there will be "sales" signs up this weekend, but that is more a way to lure customers into the stores rather than an attempt to clear merchandise.

Retailers aren't the only ones concerned about the success of this weekend. Manufacturers are waiting to see how well their products sell and whether stores that have stocked their shelves conservatively place orders. NEC Corp., which is trying to take away part of Nintendo's share of the video game market, found retailers were buying only enough merchandise to carry them through this weekend, said Ken Wirt, a company's vice president.

Iraqis treat American 'human shields' to Thanksgiving dinner at fancy club

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Nearly half a world from home, 12 American hostages sat down Thursday to a Thanksgiving turkey meal.

They were joined by a few relatives and the Iraqi officials holding them as "human shields."

The bizarre celebration was held in the Hunting Club, one of Iraq's most exclusive, exclusive, and fashionable Mansour district of the Iraqi capital. Most of the club's elite members of the club, which stands in a tree-lined park.

The hostages were brought to Baghdad from unidentified strategic locations as far as 280 miles west and north of the capital, officials

said. No guards were seen at the club. The Iraqis call the hundreds of foreigners held in Iraq and occupied Kuwait "guests."

Iraqi government officials joined the Americans for lunch, arranged by the American Red Cross Society, and provided the wine for the meal.

There was turkey, chicken, ham, cranberry sauce, and a less than small serving of hope for the hostage families.

Bill Stevenson, 44, said he, his brother, James, and sister, Mary Trundy, came to Baghdad to speak of peace, to see their brother John and to take him home with them.

The first two they have done, the third and most important will have to wait.

Iraqi officials did release some hostages on Thanksgiving. But despite pleas, protests, appeals and requests, none of them were American.

Bill Stevenson, 44, said he got no encouragement for his private mission from his neighbors, co-workers or the government. He said he had to quit his job in Panama City, Fla., to travel to Iraq.

His brother, John, 44, a computer specialist who had worked in Kuwait for more than 10 years, was picked up in October in Kuwait and eventually taken to a military site.

"We are a very close, tight-knit family," said Bill. "I am here for my brother."

Despite the circumstances, the atmosphere at the Hunting Club was convivial. Some of the hostages had known each other in Kuwait before they were seized in Iraq's Aug. 2 invasion of the emirate.

They embraced each other as they met for the first time since their detention began.

Among those brought to the club was Donald Whitley, 49, of Shreveport, La., who is believed to be the first American seized by the Iraqis less than 30 minutes after they invaded Kuwait.

Whitley said he was sleeping in the Kuwait Oil Co. camp in an oil field near the border when the Iraqis stormed in. He was held with three other American drillers. "I've a legitimate reason to go home," he said. "My father's very ill and I want to see him before he dies."

Band finally invited to Christmas parade

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Hollywood High School marching band, once so bad the chamber of commerce banned it from playing in the Hollywood Christmas Parade, returns this year with snappy new uniforms and renewed spirit. On Sunday, the band will join other bands, floats and performers in the 1990 parade after an eight-year

absence. "This is going to be our crowning glory," said band director Joe Montgomery. "Two years ago, we had seven people."

The band now boasts 99 members, although only 50 will participate in the parade. For all its progress, the band has only "enough red-white-and-silver uniforms to outfit half of its members."

Soviet aid need not shown yet

WASHINGTON (AP) — There is no evidence of widespread hunger in the Soviet Union, one of the world's biggest grain growers, and a food aid program shouldn't be necessary this year, U.S. officials say.

"They produce an awful lot of meat and potatoes," one analyst said. "Germany already has pledged food aid to the Soviets, and President Bush said in Paris this week he would want to try to help...if there's a real need there." Canada, Italy and Spain all have extended bank credits and in some cases pledges of other assistance to help the beleaguered Gorbachev government.

The United States and other Western countries may join forces to feed the Soviet people if starvation appears imminent, but U.S. specialists in Soviet agriculture, economic and political affairs said in interviews this week there is no evidence at this point of genuine need. "Food aid shouldn't be necessary this year," said one highly placed State Department official, who discussed the situation on condition he not be identified. "The countryside appears to have food. The agricultural regions of the Soviet Union and the cities in those regions appear to have food. Moscow and Leningrad, while obviously not an overflying comucopia, have food.

The grain harvest was exceptionally good this year, milk production is at record levels and meat could exceed last year's levels.

Army considers freezing discharges from U.S. bases

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army is considering freezing the release of officers and enlisted personnel from units in the United States to strengthen its pool of potential reinforcements for troops in the Persian Gulf, officials said Thursday.

Defense Department and Army public affairs officers said the action would expand a policy that has been in effect since August curtailing release of active duty troops in the Gulf region and of personnel in some specialties who have not gone overseas.

Lt. Col. Stuart Wagner, a Defense Department spokesman, said the Army had been working on a "conceptual plan" that he understood would "expand it to include virtually everyone."

Army spokeswoman Judy Johnston said that "as of last night the policy was not finalized" but that

"there are policy changes under consideration."

One Pentagon official who declined to be quoted by name said an announcement concerning the policy change was being prepared and might be issued Friday.

Capt. Barbara Goggin, another Army public affairs officer, said under an order issued by President Bush in August the services have had the authority to extend the service of troops in the Gulf region who come to the end of their enlistment or to their retirement date.

In the Army, she said, this also has applied to some specialists in support units in the United States. She said some units had been added and some removed from the list from time to time.

The spokeswoman said one of the options being considered would expand this to include all officers and enlisted personnel, not just those with skills identified as critical.

The New York Times, quoting officials whom it did not identify, said in Thursday's editions that the Army had decided to halt about 1,500 re-

irements and enlistment expirations a month.

The Washington Post, also quoting unnamed sources, said the policy change was expected to take effect Dec. 1.

Ms. Johnston said the changes being considered also would trim vacations for trainees. Depending on the final decision, she said, such vacations could be reduced in length or eliminated.

Officials quoted by the Post said the policy change also would put an end to transfers unrelated to the situ-

ation in the Gulf. Wagner said he did not know whether the other services were contemplating similar action.

Some experts have said they believed a halt to the release of officers and enlisted personnel was needed to assure the Army of enough combat-ready replacements for those who would be killed or wounded in a Gulf war.

Each year, 10 percent of the Army officer corps of 104,375 and 20 percent of the 625,517 enlisted personnel leave voluntarily, officials said.

New clean air law holds promise for environmental companies

WASHINGTON (AP) — For five years David Sundstrom has tried to sell utilities on a system that turns coal into cleanburning gas and produces electricity with less pollution.

Usually they would listen, he says, and then sit on their hands.

Utility executives now are seeking out Sundstrom's company, Destec Energy Inc., and trekking in steady numbers to the Dow Chemical subsidiary's coal gasification demonstration plant in Louisiana to learn more.

"There is now a line outside the door. There will be plenty of business for Destec," says Charles Goff, the company's president. Its one-man sales force is being expanded.

The smiles at Destec — and at hundreds of environmental services companies like it nationwide — stem from the 1990 Clean Air Act signed into law by President Bush on Nov. 15, marking a new era in air pollution controls.

The tougher clean air requirements that will be phased in over the

next dozen years are expected to cost polluters — and their customers — as much as \$11 billion a year within five years and more than \$25 billion a year by the 2005. That's money that will be going into someone else's pocketbook.

Destec hopes to capture a large chunk of the money.

So do low-sulfur coal producers, manufacturers of auto emissions equipment, builders of \$100 million "scrubbers" for power plants, designers of pollution monitoring gear, brokers in pollution allowances and dozens of lawyers and consultants needed to make sense of the dozens of new government regulations yet to come.

The Environmental Protection Agency also is hiring people to help develop and implement the regulations.

"There are going to be an awful lot of people that will be big winners," says Bruce Braine, a vice president of ICF Resources Inc., an environmental consulting firm in Fairfax, Va.

The new clean air law will require

tougher emissions controls on automobiles, force factories and thousands of businesses to install new pollution control equipment, and require that electric utilities cut in half releases of sulfur dioxide that cause acid rain.

Electric rate payers will see higher bills, especially in parts of the Midwest; car prices likely will go up, as will gasoline and possibly other products.

The acid rain requirements will force utilities to buy expensive pollution control equipment or shift away from high-sulfur coal.

That has people smiling at the A.T. Massey Coal Co. in Richmond, Va., the biggest producer of low-sulfur coal in the East, where T-shirts have begun to sprout declaring "Massey Lite Coal: High in BTUs, Low in Sulfur."

"We're trying to give Massey an identity," says Jerry Eyster, vice president for corporate development. He predicts competition will be keen with western low-sulfur coal producers.

That's fine with the Burlington

Northern Railroad, one of the major shippers of low-sulfur coal out of Wyoming's Powder River Basin.

The railroad has begun test runs of coal shipments farther East than normal and anticipates that the clean air requirements will boost volume by 10 percent.

A key and innovative part of the new law will allow utilities to trade pollution allowances to ease the cost of compliance. That has telephones ringing in the Washington office of AERX, a company that specializes in such trades.

"Clearly we're going to be a winner," says John Palmisano, president and founder of the firm. "We're hir-

ing. We look at 1991 as a good year and 1992 as a very good year."

The natural gas industry also sees dollar signs. Industrial plants and electric utilities will use the cleaner fuel, as will fleet vehicle operators in metropolitan, smog-clogged cities.

Pacific Gas & Electric Co. in California hopes to capitalize with plans to develop a network of outlets dispensing natural gas for fleet vehicles and eventually private cars.

At Tecongen Inc. in Waltham, Mass., the clean air bill means a major marketing boost for a new engine that uses compressed natural gas. The company already has an agreement to supply 10 of the engines for

school buses as part of a pilot program in California, but now expects interest to jump.

Ravinder Sakhuja, Tecongen's president, said the company is expected to triple its revenue from the current \$20 million a year, within four or five years because of new business.

Companies like Allied-Signal Automotive Catalyst Co. in Tulsa, Okla., also expect business to prosper as automakers will demand more sophisticated emissions control equipment.

"The R&D people, the engineering people, those people are winners," said Jim Hiera, the company's director of marketing.

Many U.S. universities finding cheating among students a normal part of school

Michael Moffatt, an anthropology professor at Rutgers University, had been an innocent about student cheating.

But that was before he surveyed students and discovered, as he put it, that the New Jersey state school "sounds like a place where cheating comes almost as naturally as breathing, where it's an academic skill almost as important as reading, writing and math."

Rutgers is not alone, according to Moffatt's controversial study, which suggests that most large, impersonal universities in the United States are hotbeds of dishonesty. Grade-crazed students, he contends, should share blame with inept bureaucrats and remote professors who create an alienating atmosphere in much of American higher education.

Experts across the country are divided in reaction to Moffatt's survey. Some say that the '90s appear to be a new era of ethics on campuses, with less obsession with the idea that grades are the only key to a good career. Others say that the Rutgers sam-

pling confirms their own research — and worst fears.

About 45 percent of the 232 students in Moffatt's survey reported that they had cheated occasionally, and an additional 33 percent admitted cheating more regularly. Respondents described elaborate cribbing and copying techniques in anonymous essays worthy of doctoral degrees in subterfuge.

Among hard-core cheaters, the most prevalent method was copying answers from another student's test either by plan or chance. Next came studying with the help of old tests, on the assumption that professors change multiple-choice exams little if at all between semesters. Using cheat sheets, plagiarizing term papers and stealing tests in advance also were popular methods.

Members of fraternities and sororities appeared more likely to cheat than non-members because of the pressure to share answers with Greek brothers and sisters.

And economics majors were the worst offenders, leading Moffatt to ask whether such dishonesty is "anticipatory socialization for modern

American business life?"

The study cited many motives, including keeping up with competition for entrance into prestigious graduate schools and simply wanting to party, not study. But the most damaging to academia's reputation is the widespread motive of revenge against large lecture classes and against professors who value their own research more than teaching.

"With all the inducements for cheating in undergraduate education, my question now has become: Why doesn't everyone cheat rather than resist temptation?" Moffatt said in an interview.

A national survey in 1987 conducted through the University of California, Los Angeles' Graduate School of Education found a smaller but still worrisome problem: 18 percent of college sophomores admitted to cheating on an exam, 29 percent copied homework and 36 percent did either or both.

U.S. loses ally with Thatcher's withdrawal

CAIRO, Egypt — For almost a decade, Margaret Thatcher was regarded at the White House as America's best friend, the trusted ally whose strong views reinforced the conservative tone of administration policies.

Among Western allies, she was alone at Ronald Reagan's side in 1986 in supporting the U.S. bombing of Libya. In the Persian Gulf crisis, she boldly joined with George Bush in sending troops to the Middle East.

"You always know where she was and what she believed," Bush said upon hearing of her decision to resign. "She has always been an outstanding ally of the United States," he said. "I will miss her."

There were many doubters around the world when Reagan arrived in Washington with an economic program of free-market capitalism that seemed out of step with the times. Mrs. Thatcher wasn't one of the skeptics; she was advocating a similar program at home.

They shared rocky relations with organized labor. Reagan successfully fired the nation's air traffic controllers, dealing a devastating blow to labor. She, too, always wanted to see unions.

On foreign policy, she frequently was more right wing than Reagan — certainly more so than Bush.

Reagan never made any secret of his special affection for the British prime minister. They were ideological soulmates and called each other "Ron" and "Margie" at international gatherings; they usually were side by side.

Two years ago as they met for the first time before Reagan left office, the president said he was leaving the White House with "considerable satisfaction in the knowledge that Margaret Thatcher will still reside at No. 10 Downing Street."

She later wrote him a "Dear Ron" letter in which she praised him as "a great president, one of the greatest."

Like Reagan, she was deeply suspicious of the Soviet Union. Together they advocated a hard line toward Moscow and championed military readiness — even though she was the first to recognize Mikhail S. Gorbachev as a leader she could do business with.

Mrs. Thatcher encouraged the huge Pentagon buildup that Reagan nurtured under the theme of peace through strength. She was a big backer of U.S. efforts to install medium-range missiles in Europe and always seemed cautious, perhaps reluctant — when it came to disarmament.

When Argentina and Britain clashed militarily over the Falkland Islands, the United States was forced to make a painful choice between two allies. Ronnie sided with Margaret.

Washington's special relationship with London seemed to slip when Reagan left power. Bush and Mrs. Thatcher disagreed publicly last year over her government's decision to deport Vietnamese and

Cambodian "boat people" who were fleeing their countries to Hong Kong.

Bush, a veteran of world politics, knew many leaders around the globe. Mrs. Thatcher suddenly seemed to be just one of the gang.

The Berlin Wall was collapsing and it appeared as if Bush found German Chancellor Helmut Kohl more interesting than Mrs. Thatcher. She was merely one in a parade of foreign dignitaries who got the prized invitation to visit Bush at Camp David this year.

Nevertheless, Bush said he expected the "special relationship" between the United States and Great Britain to remain on a "steady keel."

Mrs. Thatcher did her part, demonstrating her loyalty. For awhile she and Bush were seemingly alone in their suspicions of Gorbachev's unilateral cutbacks in troops and arms in Europe, and appeared uncertain how to respond.

Under intense pressure from Congress, Bush began to warm to the Soviet leader. Now they seem almost best of friends.

On the Persian Gulf, Bush said he would not rule out possible military force, and ordered a huge buildup of troops to make his threat credible. Mrs. Thatcher, characteristically, was tougher.

She said that unless Saddam Hussein got out of Kuwait soon, the West would have to use military force to dislodge him. She called Saddam "a loser," and the state-controlled Iraqi news agency replied that she was an "old hag."

Now, she is leaving. No one suspects that Britain's new leadership — whoever it is — will take a soft line toward Iraq. Yet, if the going gets tough, it might have been comforting for Bush to be able to hear the tough old line from Thatcher.

2 Americans among dead in plane crash

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Two Americans were among 38 people who died in the crash of a Thai plane carrying foreign vacationers to a resort island, the U.S. Embassy said Thursday.

U.S. Embassy spokesman James Williams said at least two Americans were aboard — Edward G. Lincoln and Miss Kathleen Lincoln. Williams said he had no other immediate information. The Bangkok Airways plane slammed into coconut trees in heavy rain and gusty wind late Wednesday as it prepared to land on Koh Samui, police said. Witnesses said it exploded and then crashed about six miles from the airport.

Europeans seek look into Gladio

STRASBOURG, France (AP) — The European Parliament on Thursday called for an investigation into the activities of secret anti-communist organizations set up in the 1950s to counter a possible Soviet invasion of Western Europe.

In a resolution passed by a vote of 65-41 with 13 abstentions, the Parliament also asked the 12 EC governments to look into possible links between the networks of secret groups and right-wing terrorism in Europe over the last two decades.

The resolution urged the governments to undertake a "full investigation into the nature, structure, aims and all other aspects of these clandestine organizations."

The network was organized by West European intelligence agencies to carry out sabotage and surveillance in case of a Soviet invasion.

It involved hundreds of operatives with access to extensive caches of weapons, according to recent disclosures by West European officials.

Some officials have suggested that the organization, called "Gladio" after its Italian code name, was involved in right-wing terrorism during the 1970s, especially in Italy.

The Parliament, the European Community's assembly, condemned the network, which it said had "escaped all democratic control." Some government leaders said they knew nothing about the clandestine groups in their countries.

The Parliament called on EC governments to dismantle any remaining "clandestine—military—and paramilitary networks."

The assembly urged EC governments to examine the network's "composition and modus operandi and to clarify any action they may have taken to destabilize the democratic structures of the (EC) member states."

The resolution singled out the United States for special criticism, protesting "vigorously" against the efforts of U.S. officials "to encourage the establishment in Europe" of such a network.

Ex-allies battle for presidency

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Two years ago, Lech Walesa and Stanislaw Mazowiecki shared the Nobel Peace Prize for their roles in toppling Communist rule. They won the war but lost each other.

On Sunday, 27 million voters in Poland's first popular presidential election will write the final chapter to Eastern Europe's most celebrated political divorce — deciding which of them will hold the nation's highest office.

The polls say Walesa is far ahead. The strong-willed Solidarity chairman who inspires some and frightens others is striving to craft an amazing biography by succeeding his former Communist nemesis, Gen. Wojciech Jaruzelski, as president.

Mazowiecki, the cautious and equally stubborn prime minister, is opposing him.

And now, a dark horse has emerged. A wealthy, mystery-shrouded emigre businessman, Stanislaw Tyminski, has returned after 21 years in Canada and Peru. His fresh face, free-spending campaign and sharp attacks on former leaders have garnered him enough support to overtake Mazowiecki in at least one pre-election survey.

Three remaining candidates — ex-Communist Wlodzimierz Cimoszewski, Peasant Party hopeful Roman Bartoszewicz and Leszek Moczulski — have failed to generate significant backing.

If nobody wins a majority, the contest goes to a runoff Dec. 9.

The president will be sworn in before the National Assembly by Christmas. The election is considered to be not-voting primarily against the former Communist system. Rather, it is choosing between differing visions of the new democratic system.

Walesa, the technical-school educated electrician who has led Solidarity from its birth in 1980 and won the 1983 Nobel Peace Prize for his defense of workers' rights, is dynamic and volatile. His opponents say he could become a dictator or at least destabilize the country.

Mazowiecki is a Catholic journalist and ex-political prisoner who in August 1989 with Walesa's backing became East Europe's first non-Communist head of government. His opponents say he is reluctant to take the nation's reins, but is tough enough to satisfy public moods, risking a social explosion.

Walesa and Mazowiecki were allies until the dissolution of their former common opponent, the Communist Party, in January. Over the next months, Walesa began negotiating from Gdansk to replace the president and the 65 percent of the lower parliament chamber that has been conceded to the Communists in a power-sharing bargain by Solidarity last year.

MOSCOW (AP) — A man accused of selling military secrets to a Western government has been found guilty and sentenced to 10 years imprisonment, the Tass news agency said Thursday.

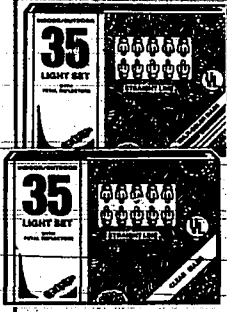

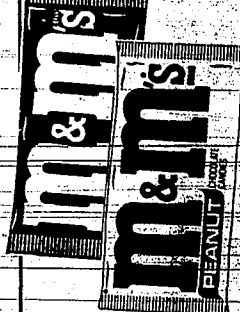

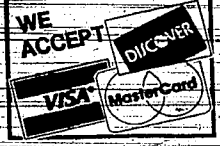

Akihito's enthronement climaxes in all-night ritual

TOKYO — Wearing the white silk robes of a high Shinto priest, Japan's Emperor Akihito communed with his mythical ancestor, the Sun Goddess Thursday night in a torchlight enthronement ritual that was clouded by controversy over the constitutional separation of religion and state.

The government-funded religious ceremony climaxed Akihito's elaborate rite of passage into emperorship, which began nearly two years ago with the death of his father, Hirohito.

Tradition dictated that Akihito celebrate his formal enthronement only after a year of mourning had passed and sacred rice had been grown and harvested for the Daijosi, or Great Food Offering. In a secular ceremony held Nov. 12 and attended by representatives of 158 nations, Akihito announced his accession to the world.

The meaning of the rite is shrouded in mystery and obscured by the vicissitudes of an imperial succession that spans more than a millennium, but in its essence it is a ritual of thanksgiving.

Akihito, surrounded by chamber-

lains and assisted by court maidens, offered freshly harvested rice and millet and an array of other foods from the land and the sea to Amaterasu O-mikami, as the Sun Goddess is called. He also recited a prayer to the deity for the welfare of the Japanese people, according to a description of the private ceremony by Imperial Household Agency officials. The ritual continued until dawn Friday, as Akihito repeated the offerings in two primitive huts built on the grounds of the Imperial Palace — one representing western Japan, the other eastern Japan.

To some conservative Japanese,

the secretive goings-on inside the darkened enthronement huts sym-

bolized Emperor Akihito's final transformation into a divine being.

Sikh extremists kill 16 bus riders

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Suspected Sikh gunmen on Thursday ambushed three buses, killing at least 16 people in the attacks outside the capital of Punjab state, news agencies reported.

United News of India said the attacks took place near Faroli village outside Chandigarh, 150 miles north of New Delhi.

The United News of India said state police chief K.P.S. Gill confirmed 16 deaths. Several people were injured, Gill was quoted as saying.

Press Trust of India quoted unnamed police sources as saying that 25 people were killed.

Archaeological site won't have protective slabs when dig done

EAST WENATCHEE, Wash. (AP) — When a controversial archaeological dig concludes next week, no concrete slabs will protect the site from thieves, dig director Michael Gramly says.

And apple trees may be replanted over it, he adds.

That is the latest word in an escalating battle involving Gramly, state regulators and the Colville Indians over excavation of an 11,000-year-old Clovis site containing artifacts from some of the continent's first humans.

Gramly is "quite obviously trying to inflame the public against the Colvilles, the state, of Washington and professionals in the archaeological community," Colville Tribal Councilman Dale Kohler said Tuesday.

Gramly alleged Monday that because of interference by Indians and area archaeologists, valuable artifacts and information he had to leave in the ground could be lost to science forever.

Gramly said property owner Dr. Mack Richey, unhappy about the controversy, intends to plant apple trees over the finds.

Tribal Councilman Mathew Dick said that if remaining artifacts are stolen, the blame will fall on Gramly for continually advertising their existence.

Tribal leaders expressed concerns before the dig that bones of their ancestors might be disturbed.

Gramly had a state permit but voluntarily agreed to restrictions that prevented full excavation of the site.

No bones have been found but some artifacts remain in the ground because of the restrictions. They include one rare bone tool that the Indians have denied Gramly's request to remove.

Ground-penetrating radar, used in 1988, detected other objects in the ground believed to be artifacts. Those areas also were not dug.

"I'll let the public decide whether or not he should because he can't finish scientific research or because he can't go after the rest of the artifacts," Dick said.

A state official has confirmed that no concrete slabs will protect the site located in an apple orchard.

But Jake Thomas, state historic preservation officer, said he understands there will be security arrangements of some sort. He said he could not say what they will be.

Don Krupp, deputy director of the state Department of Community Development, said the state has not considered buying the property and that he believes landowner Richey is not interested in selling.

Richey, a Bellevue plastic surgeon, has not returned telephone calls for comment.

"I would be concerned about the planting of trees that might be deleterious to the anything that might be in the ground," Krupp said.

Thomas said it would be inappropriate to plant trees because of the potential for disturbance by roots and equipment.

FBI's Hoover leery of BYU, files suggest

WASHINGTON (AP) — Alleged subversive activities at Brigham Young University may have deterred former FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover from taking an honorary degree there, according to a newspaper story.

What? BYU? That clean-cut Mormon Church-owned school which is now a favorite recruiting spot for the bureau?

A story in Thursday's Deseret News said newly revealed files suggest Hoover, despite a long and cordial correspondence with then Church President David O. McKay, who was also chairman of BYU's board of trustees, rejected the offer after learning of telephone calls to the Soviet Union by BYU students, curious about freedom of religion.

However, former FBI agent and ultraconservative W. Cleon Skousen, said Hoover told him he didn't have time to travel to Provo. The incident occurred during 1956, at the height of the Red Scare.

The Deseret News reports it obtained the memo from a Freedom of Information Act request that led to the release of FBI files on McKay, who was also chairman of BYU's board of trustees.

Skousen, a former FBI agent who at the time was a BYU professor, called Hoover's office on behalf of school President Ernest L. Wilkinson, offering the FBI director an honorary doctorate and a chance to speak at the school.

Documents say Skousen — who would later found the conservative National Center for Constitutional Studies — also told the FBI that Robert Hinkley, an official of the American Broadcasting Co., was willing to work out extensive radio and television coverage.

If Hoover spoke, the newspaper said.

Hoover apparently was interested, but before accept it he ordered agents to "let me know something of background of & our contacts with Brigham Young University."

Tractor, driven by sister, kills boy

Boys force mistrial for dad

A new trial will be scheduled later. He is accused of re-questioning a government jet while pretending to be a federal attorney, then flying to Seattle to get his girlfriend.

Allegations of cold fusion fraud unfounded, investigation finds

HOUSTON (AP) — Allegations that Texas A&M researchers spiked water with tritium to fake cold nuclear fusion are apparently unfounded, an internal panel said.

The panel, in a report dated Oct. 15 and released by the university Sunday, also recommended that investigations into the charges be stopped.

The report was written by three Texas A&M professors assigned to investigate the research that followed the March 1989 claim by two other scientists that they had achieved cold fusion in a beaker of room-temperature water.

Such a discovery would create a cheap, clean and virtually inexhaustible supply of energy.

As scientists all over the world rushed to confirm the discovery, by B. Stanley Pons of the University of Utah and Martin Fleischmann of the

University of Southampton, England, the journal Science suggested in its June 15, 1989, issue that some A&M experiments had been tainted.

One such experiment, conducted by A&M chemist John O'Malley Beckris, involved running a series of electrolytic cells modeled after those in Utah. Some cells sporadically produced tritium, a standard byproduct of nuclear fusion. The experiment was the strongest evidence anywhere for cold fusion.

But critics questioned the results, saying the tritium was not accompanied by other fusion byproducts, and suggested the experiment had been spiked with tritium.

The report concluded spiking was unlikely because of similar observations in other laboratories and reported results by scientists who intentionally spiked water with tritium.

"While it is not possible for us to categorically exclude spiking as a possibility, it is our opinion that possibility is much less probable than that of inadvertent contamination or other unexplained factors in the measurements," the report said.

The report recommended that investigations into the spiking allegations be dropped.

The report said that in general, the furor over the alleged discovery of cold fusion caused scientists at Texas A&M to rush their research and lose scientific objectivity, but concluded that none of the experiments was conducted fraudulently.

The A&M report noted that researchers are still trying to confirm Pons and Fleischmann's discovery, but so far have failed, leaving the scientific community skeptical that the two actually achieved cold fusion.

Dumping dessert into storm drain costs Utah man \$500

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — A Utah County man has been fined \$500 for dumping 1,000 pounds of raspberry gelatin dessert into a storm drain.

Evan D. Hansen was charged with violating the state's Water Pollution Control Act following a Sept. 5 contest in which participants attempted to perform the most outrageous stunts to win \$5,000 from a local radio station.

Hansen won by cutting the roof from a station wagon, filling it with raspberry gelatin and topping it with

whipped cream. He then dressed in a white tuxedo, submerged in the gelatin and drove the car a sacross the parking lot.

Problems occurred when he attempted to dispose of the waste gelatin, Hansen said, he hired a waste disposal company to remove the gelatin from his car but their pump clogged. So he dumped it into a storm drain which empties into Big Cottonwood Creek.

"I knew it was biodegradable and figured the rain would take care of it," said Hansen. "I'm sure there was absolutely no damage."

Friends pay tribute to ex-Utah governor

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Former Gov. Herbert B. Maw was buried at the Salt Lake City Cemetery following services in which relatives, friends and politicians paid tribute.

The former Democratic governor died Nov. 17 in a Salt Lake nursing home of causes incident to age. He was 92.

Gov. Norm Bangert said during the services Wednesday that Maw's leadership moved Utah forward during the years of World War II "and the transition from war to peace time."

A veteran of World War I, Maw served three terms in the Utah Senate, beginning in 1928 and was elected Senate president in 1935.

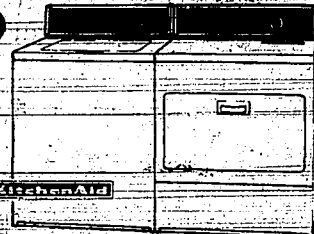

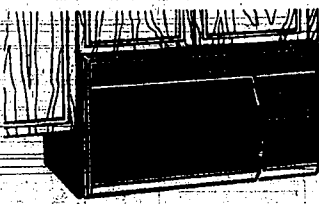

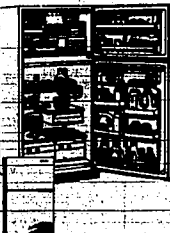

Egyptian president's quick opposition in gulf crisis paying off

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Hosni Mubarak, Egypt's prudent president, took an uncharacteristic political gamble in leading Arab opposition to Iraq's Saddam Hussein.

That gamble appears to be paying off, experts say, as Mubarak played host to U.S. President George Bush for a 19-hour visit starting Thanksgiving night.

It was a clever move, said political science professor Earl Sullivan of American University in Cairo. It cost him nothing as long as his troops stay on the front line in Saudi Arabia, and it ensured that Saddam could not proclaim to the Arabs that his brother Mubarak was a traitor to the Arab cause.

Despite that, said Battle, Egypt's economy has suffered a net loss since the turmoil began. Battle, retired director of Washington's Middle East Institute, said Mubarak has performed "extraordinarily well" in difficult circumstances.

"He has a real need for a relationship with United States, partly economic and partly political," Battle said from his home in Washington.

Work on the Iraqi project is reportedly being conducted at the Saad 16 facility near the city of Mosul, at another site in a mountain near Irbil, and at the Tuwaitina nuclear center outside Baghdad.

But Israel, citing intelligence information, said Iraq was using the reactors to produce nuclear weapons with the help of 150 pounds of enriched uranium supplied by France.

Nonetheless, State Department officials say Iraq could have acquired other uranium which is not under the inspection program.

British customs agents, acting on a tip from U.S. officials, earlier this year seized a shipment of krypton to Iraq. Krypton is used to detonate nuclear weapons.

Despite evidence to contrary, college football playoffs not needed

There are times when you must admit that the evidence against you is overwhelming. It happened to some poor souls in every episode of "Perry Mason." It happened to Richard Nixon; to Milli and Vanilli; to the Denver Broncos shortly after kickoff in the last Super Bowl. Now, it is happening to me. I come to you today with hands in the air, admitting defeat.

Yes, I've paid my taxes. Yes, I've paid my parking tickets. But, no, at least for this year, I'm not on the right side of the debate about using a playoff tournament to determine the No. 1 team in college football. I'm against it. Always have been, always will be. But 1990 has been a bad year for the anti-playoff lobby.

The current system of polls and bowls — to which I'm particular, and which almost always works — has been a colossal failure this year. The race for No. 1 is a gloom of nonsense, and it won't be any clearer after the bowls, because the big bowls grow weary and greedy and committed too early.

The current No. 1, the Colorado Buffaloes, would be far down the list if some officials hadn't erred and given them a fifth down in the last second against Missouri, turning a loss into a win. The Buffs' record should show two losses and a tie, but because it doesn't, they've risen to No. 1.

The No. 2 team, Miami, especially will be a poor record than Nos. 3, 4,

5, 6, 10, 12 and 20. They're ranked high because they lost early instead of late.

There are top teams with better records than Miami. Texas is 8-1 against a schedule including Colorado, Penn State, Houston, Oklahoma and Texas A&M. The No. 6 Longhorns should be No. 2. Miami belongs behind No. 7 Notre Dame. Both have two losses, and the Irish whipped the Hurricanes.

A playoff would generate millions. But I'm convinced the money would only further separate the haves and have-nots. Doubt it? Look at the havoc wreaked by the billion-dollar basketball deal.

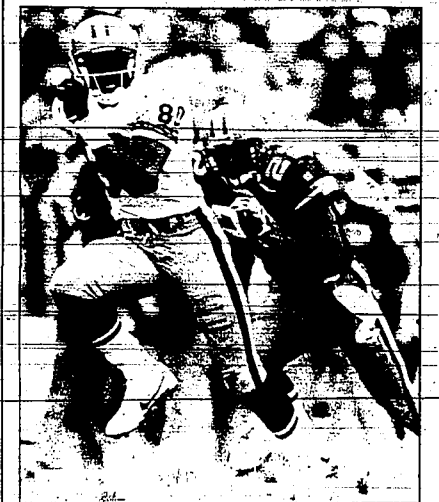
The big wallets are squeezing the little ones, such as Towson State, right off the playing field. These people only get behind greedily. Give them enough money, and they'll shoot everyone.

The main reason I'm anti-playoff, though, is I love the ambiguity and arguments of polls-and-bowls. It is maddening, idiosyncratic and a little insane. A playoff would be sterile, professional. What's wrong with a touch of vagueness, especially if it usually gets resolved? Are we so

simple that we need everything spelled out plainly?

This is not the year for me to be on this soapbox, though. The bowls didn't do themselves proud. They got paranoid and lined up teams before the signing date, and now the Sugar is a dud and the Orange isn't as hot as it could have been.

The Cotton got lucky with Miami, — if Texas makes it. The Rose is a washout. The Fiesta is a Fiasco, but that's another story. And the Sugar is the system just broke down this year. It happens, and the pro-playoff crowd (PPPP) always come flying in waving their plans and mock brackets. I admit they've got the evidence this year. My white flag is up. But we start over again next September, and my white flag comes down. As Jimmy Caney said: "You may think you got me, but you doesn't."

49ers' Rice heading for the record books

SANTA CLARA, Calif. (AP) — Jerry Rice believes no pass is designed for a short gain.

Every time Rice makes a catch he goes for the end zone. And judging from his career so far, he is quickly becoming the most productive receiver in NFL history.

Rice has 77 touchdown passes in less than six seasons with the San Francisco 49ers, ranking him 10th on the NFL's all-time list for career TD receptions. No receiver ranked ahead of him played less than 10 seasons.

"He thinks 'Touchdown' every time no matter what the route is," said 49ers receivers coach Sherman Lewis, who has coached Rice since he was a rookie in 1985. "When he catches the ball, his mental outlook is to score. He's not thinking of catching it for a 5-yard gain."

The NFL has watched Wayne Gretzky rewrite its record book through the 1980s. Major League baseball has seen Rickey Henderson establish new standards for base-stealing. Rice has quickly reced up the NFL's all-time receiving lists at an unprecedented pace.

Rice says too many people are trying to put into perspective his rapid climb up the NFL's all-time lists. With 412 career catches, Rice is 98 catches shy of 10th place on the top-10 all-time reception list. He should crack that list sometime during the '92 season, his eighth in the league.

"I'm really hearing about that more now," Rice said. "If you let it go to your head, you're in trouble. I feel I'm still learning, and there's more to come. From Jerry Rice, I want to get better somehow and I will."

Through 86 regular-season games, Rice has caught two touchdown passes — 11 times — three touchdowns passes five times, and, on Oct. 14, he caught five touchdown passes in a 45-35 victory over the Atlanta Falcons.

In 1987, Rice set an NFL record with 22 touchdown catches, 14 more than the previous record set by Miami's Mark Clayton in 1957. "The thing about me is that I like to catch the short passes, the passes underneath, and I make something happen," said Rice. "I believe I can do something with the ball when I catch the short passes."

That's because a sixth sense takes over when Rice runs. He has the ability to feel the pressure on the field, to know exactly every body is at," he said. "I know where the pressure is com-

ing from and I try to run the opposite way.

"Somehow I can see the entire field. It's like having eyes in the back of your head. You have that certain feel. There might be a guy chasing you from behind. You know this guy is back there. You know not to run back into this guy."

Rice's scoring sense has been nurtured by constant feeding from the 49ers' playbook.

"We go him a lot in the 'Red Zone,' (the 49ers' term for the part of the field between a 20-yard line and the end zone)," Lewis said. "We know that he's a definite threat down there, so we look for him. That's when he wants the ball. He's scored touchdowns all his life. Ever since he was in college, he's been used to scoring touchdowns. So I think his success is a combination of our philosophy and his ability."

Ever since being chosen as the 49ers' 1985 first-round draft choice, after catching 28 touchdown passes at Mississippi Valley State, Rice has been blessed with catching passes from the league's top passer in Joe Montana.

"At times you might draw a play up on paper and it's not going to work like that," Rice, 6-foot-2 and 200 pounds, said. "You've got to improvise. You've got to know exactly what I'm going to be on the field. So we have that chemistry from working together so much."

Say Steve Young started this weekend, I wouldn't have the feel for Steve the way I have a feel for Joe. It would limit me. With Joe I can take that chance. At times I take a lot of chances because Joe, he knows I'm going to be in the area somehow doing something. It's funny."

Even though Rice has been forced to improvise because of injuries and triple teams, he has a league-leading 66 catches this season for a league-leading 1,052 yards.

"I know that every week that it's going to be a challenge for me because they are out to stop me. They are going to take shots. They are going to try to intimidate me," Rice said. "If they want to take you out of a game, double-cover you or what ever, they can do it. But that's boring to me."

"I've worked myself into this predicament. I'd love to go out and be just like every other receiver and just go one-on-one with a defender. It would be fun."

Rice won't be seeing that kind of coverage any time soon.

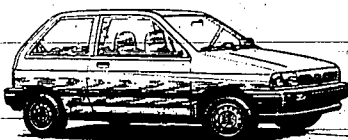

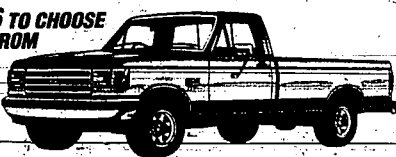

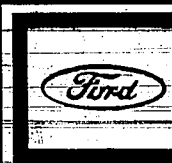

\$1.76 million for violin sets auction record

LONDON (AP) - A 270-year-old Stradivarius violin named after the descendant of its composer, Felix Mendelssohn sold for \$1.76 million, the highest price paid at auction for a musical instrument, Christie's said.

The violin, known as The Mendelssohn, was purchased by a private buyer in the salesman who asked not to be identified.

The violin was named after its owners in the 19th century, the Mendelssohn family of Berlin.

"It was owned by an American collector for the past 35 years and he probably played it a bit," said William Hanham, the auctioneer's spokesman.

Antonio Stradivari made the violin in Cremona, Italy, in 1720 to ward the end of his "golden period" when he produced the finest instruments. The greatest ones are usually given personal names.

The previous musical instrument auction record was \$1.22 million for a Stradivarius cello in 1988.

'Dances' an epic achievement for Costner

HOLLYWOOD — Kevin Costner opens his stringently fine "Dances With Wolves" by pitching us without prologue or apology into the thick of character and action.

Costner's Lt. John Dunbar, a wounded Union officer, is next in line to have his foot sawed off at Tennessee field hospital; preferring to die intact rather than mutilated, he steals back to his men. Nearly hallucinating, he chooses death by galloping between the stalemated Union and Confederate troops, drawing rebel fire and ending his pain.

During his final, full-till charge, muttering, "Father, forgive me," Dunbar drops his reins and throws his arms up and out, looking like a circus rider or a Christ figure, or both. It is a marvelous moment of cinema, but a dangerously risky one when the star is also the director, and a first-time director at that. It practically invites the professionally cool in the audience to draw, "Well, who does he think he is?"

Yet played off against Dunbar's incredulous entry in his journal, "In trying to produce my own death, I became a living hero," the movie carries exactly the aura of half-mad heroism it is supposed to. Quite clearly, Costner knows exactly who he is, what he is doing, and how to do it.

He may have studied the way Akira Kurosawa spliced his screen with a horizon line or sets a character a little off-center in the vastness of a plain; there are movements of cottonwoods and buffalo grass that may recall "Derusu Uzala," and figures against a flaming sunset that bring back "Kagemusha," but there are few wire directors to study if one is starting out.

"Dances With Wolves" is a clear-eyed vision. Authentic as an Edward Curtis photograph, lyrical as a George Catlin oil or a Karl Bodmer landscape, this is a film with a pure ring to it. It's impossible to call it anything but epic, not with scenes like the ground-shaking buffalo hunt, photographed with the camera moving at the same breakneck speed as the buffalo, while Dunbar and the young Sioux maneuver among them. The work of the buffalo-hunt camera crew is extraordinary, supplementing Dean Semler's painterly cinematography overall.

Yet somehow, because the film's screenplay, by Michael Blake, conceals itself with character, not spectacle, its epic quality is engaging, frequently punctuated with gutsy humor, never self-congratulatory. Considering the scope and the ambitiousness of the material, the success of Costner and every one of his team

earlier Costner films, solidity without dullness, unmissable minutiae, a measured watchfulness, one might suspect that the Dunbar-Costner film, as tailored to him by his friend and screenwriter Blake, is pretty close. If so, Costner's moments undercutting his own image are especially charming.

Then, in a hilarious cross-cultural encounter, the solitary lieutenant is discovered by his Sioux neighbors. Following this confrontation, the film makers have made absolute magic; curiosity replaces unease, each side tests the other gravely and is not disillusioned. Dunbar, fascinated, begins to learn something about the character of the Sioux people, tacitly teaching us at the same time.

As the Sioux come alive, a handful stand out: Kicking Bird (Graham Greene), the tribe's holy man, his hair like a falcon's top-knot; the combative Wind in His Hair (Rodney A. Grant); tribal leader Ten Bears (singer Floyd Red Crow Westerman), mastery at imposing his knowledge without appearing to; and young Smiles a Lot (Nathan Lee Chasing His Horse), witness to the best and worst in the white savagery. They are a collection of exceptional talents.

In a bow to Western movie tradition, there is also the luminous-eyed Stands With a Fist (Mary McDonnell), the white-child-raised-by-the-

tribe, who moves from mourning widow to reluctant translator to the woman Dunbar loves. Because these people so clearly possess the values and qualities Dunbar has instinctively been drawn to — only heightened and refined — the dawning knowledge of where he truly belongs emerges.

One might remark on the even disposition of every soul in this huge encampment. The natural dangers of their lives aside, these people really have a good day, every day. It's the Pawnee who are the movie's "bad Indians." In the same crabby vein, one might question why there is no other Army man who shares Dunbar's humanity, or even curiosity. But as a student of the period remarked, the West wasn't settled by humanitarians.

Dunbar is given his name Dances With Wolves after a singularly unbuttoned moment, not unlike the one in "Lawrence of Arabia" as Lawrence runs greenly in his floating white robes, only to find to his mortification that he's being watched by an Arab stranger. More important is Dunbar's ecstatic private dance at his own campfire — done with the sort of rapture Lawrence would understand — marking just how far this authentic hero has moved from the stoic Western tradition. It is exactly in the path Kicking Bird has described: the trail of a true human being.

'Jacob's Ladder' provides genuinely creepy moments

Capsule reviews

JACOB'S LADDER (R), Adrian Lyne's psychological thriller about a Vietnam vet (Tim Robbins) who experiences hallucinations. It has some genuinely creepy moments but it is too assaultive to be really pleasurable. It's a movie about inner states that's all on the outside.

CHILD'S PLAY 2 (R), Although handsomely produced, this sequel is a flat-out horror picture, morbid and uncomfortable in its effect because we're asked to watch little Alex Vincent being terrorized all over again by Chucky, the implacably evil killer doll. With Jenny Agutter, Gerni, Graham, Catherine Elise, Grace Zabriskie.

GHOST (PG-13), The movie's slogan is "Believe," not an unreasonable request. But even those who'd be happy to comply must get past a certain woolly-mindedness to its script and a production prettified to the point of stickiness. With some of its actors — Demi Moore as the cracked, desolate, jittery, whoopi Goldberg as an extremely reluctant spirit go-between and Vincent Schiavelli as an irascible, subway-dwelling ghost — things are in the best hands possible. But Patrick Swayze as a corporate New York banker? Never in 17-million-corporate-years.

HOME ALONE (PG), A 7-year-old child (Macaulay Culkin) is left behind by his parents when they jet to Paris for Christmas. Left to his own devices, he pigg out on junk food and foils a pair of bumbling thieves (Joe Pesci and Danny Aiello-Rivero). Some of the low-comic, stilted-works on a fitful, Three Stooges level, but the basic idea — an abandoned child defending himself against intruders — is a bit too seamy for comfort. Chris Columbus directed from a script by — who else? — John Hughes.

MEMPHIS BELLE (PG-13), The opening is pure old-fashioned movie stuff, but once this saga of one of the gallant B-17s who flew daylight missions over Nazi-occupied Germany gets into the air, it's unspooked, a key portrait of the true American grit under almost unbelievable conditions. Even when a few of its special effects are not great, the film's overwhelming feeling of reality holds one, while Matthew Modine, Sent Astin, Eric Stoltz and Harry Connick Jr. stand out among this 10-man crew.

QUIGLEY DOWN UNDER (PG-13), Tom Selleck and Laura San Giacomo are likably unassuming in this revisionist Western set in 1860s Australia. Where are some powerful, eruptive themes concerning the genocidal destruction of the aborigines, but most of the film plays like a panoramic episode from "Gunsmoke" or "Bonanza." As a villainous cattlebaron, Alan Rickman steals the show (as usual).

Kate Jackson says 'Stranger Within' is a real page-turner of a thriller story

Looking back at Kate Jackson's string of successful starring series roles starting in the early 1970s and continuing to the mid-1980s ("The Bionic Woman," "Charlie's Angels," "Scarecrow and Mrs. King"), grit is the common denominator of all her common-sensical, can-do heroines. But all the grit in the world can't help Mare Blackburn, the heart-torn mother Jackson plays in the TV movie "The Stranger Within" (airing Tuesday, Nov. 27, on CBS).

Sixteen years before Vietnam War-widow Mare had endured a second tragedy when her 3-year-old son Luke was kidnapped and never heard from again. Now, a 19-year-old stranger (a dark-haired Rick Schroder) has come to knock at her door, claiming to be Luke. Should she believe him?

"I didn't know," says Jackson, recalling the first time she read the movie's script. "But all I knew was that I couldn't stop turning the pages. I read it all at once, and then I looked to see who wrote it. It was John Pielmeier, who wrote 'Agnes of God.' And I knew I wanted to do it."

Pielmeier's "Agnes of God" enjoyed a successful run on Broadway as a play and became a much-praised 1985 film starring Jane Fonda, Anne Bancroft and Meg Tilly. A tale of a young nun accused of murdering her child, it was filled with unusual plot twists and suspense. So is "The Stranger Within."

Mare's boyfriend (played by Chris Sarandon) doubts the boy's story, but Mare believes it in her heart,

even after the young man grows sinister.

"Most of the roles I've done on TV before had been rather light," says Jackson. "But I had to do this heavy kind of dramatic role because it was a real challenge and a risk. If you're an actor and you don't take risks that are available, you might as well be afraid of your own shadow." Since the abrupt cancellation of Jackson's 1988 series, "Baby Boom," she has been conspicuously missing from the entertainment scene, due to a real-life situation that required true grit.

"I had breast cancer," Jackson says straight out. "But I'm fine now," she adds quickly. "If I'm trying to get a message across in these interviews, it's this: Early detection is the key to the cure. I encourage every woman from 35-40 to get a baseline mammogram."

But Jackson prefers to talk about the place where she has gotten the most pleasure over the last two years. "I have a farm in Virginia, and it's beautiful," Jackson says proudly. "It's 24 and a half acres. The original farmhouse was built in 1845, and I've put a lot of work into it. I've put in a new well, so at least now I know how a well works."

From now on, Jackson says, "I'm going to live in Virginia and come to Los Angeles only to work." During her two-year screen absence, she admits, "I really did feel burned out. I really needed time to self-reflect."

Married four times, Evans' wives include Ali MacGraw, with whom he has a son, Joshua, and Phyllis George.

The actor recently purchased a \$1.5 million castle-like home complete with turrets in the Los Feliz area of Los Angeles. Soap opera scene

After 55 years, she's still going strong

Anna Lee buzzes around the "General Hospital" sets in a motorized wheelchair as the show's matriarch Lila Quartermaine, then drives home at night.

After 55 years in the business, still a beauty, sharp as a tack and always in control, Anna Lee could easily go on forever on the soap. Although the actress rummages through shoeboxes to put together her memoirs, Miss Lee has no intention of retiring. Not with Gloria Monty returning in 10 days as "General Hospital" boss, since Gloria originally hired the British actress 14 years ago.

Anna Lee's Lila was a vibrant Quartermaine turning husband Edward Quartermaine (David Lewis) to butter. Then one day Anna's left leg became useless. Neurologists never did figure out the cause, even after a nine-and-a-half-hour operation. Fitted out with a leg brace, Anna returned to the show, leaning on two canes and then one. After bumping into cameras and other objects, she took to the wheelchair, a beaming beauty, not a poor, sickly soul crying for sympathy.

Assuming Anna Lee had multiple sclerosis, one viewer wrote in praising the actress for her courage and cheerful mien. Lila Quartermaine made viewers feel better regardless of her handicap. It never occurred to Anna Lee to take any other approach. Her back gave out the other day on the set, yet Miss Lee drove home. "I have one good leg," she said. "That's sufficient."

The actress remembers friend, actor Herbert Marshall, getting about on a wooden leg. "Herbert had a hole in his pants pocket so he could reach down and unbuckle a knee strap to ease discomfort during a scene," recalled Miss Lee. "But I can't do that with a skirt, and then work through a slip. We haven't figured that out yet. I can still drive. I refuse to give that up."

Over a year ago, Edward Quartermaine's David Lewis decided to retire because he had memory problems, so the writers killed him off in a Bermuda Triangle accident. Anna Lee wanted David back, so she suggested the "Topper" movie

idea where Roland Young's dead character conversed with the living. The idea works on "General Hospital." David Lewis reads his lines as a ghost, discussing family problems with Lila.

On camera martini glasses float through the air, cigar smoke rolls under door jams, and the Quartermaines think Lila has gone potty, talking and drinking by herself. It's a nice, light touch as life with two civilized oldsters continues. On "General Hospital" you don't just quit, you can always return as a ghost.

After three husbands, including director Robert Stevenson ("he was dull"), a crazy World War II flying Texan, and author Robert Nathan ("my best marriage"), four children and five grandchildren, acting careers in England and Hollywood, Anna Lee has seen it all.

You sit on a Rudolph Valentino couch in her living room, listen to anecdotes about director John Ford

and Gen. George Patton, and learn about the early movie days when Anna talked to Greta Garbo at parties and laughed with Robert Benchley.

Ask about the Persian Gulf situation and the actress smiles. "I was there with Jack Benny entertaining the troops in World War II. When Jack left the U.S.O. group Adolph Menjou took his place."

Not bad for an English beauty expelled at age 16 from acting school because she landed an extra job in a movie, something aspiring theater performers looked down on in the 1930s.

Earthquakes and other horror stories shoot to the top of Nielsen scoresheet

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A killer earthquake and a Stephen King horror story gripped television viewers and grabbed high ratings in the newest network ratings battle.


Part two of the death and destruction in NBC's "The Big One" finished third in A.C. Nielsen Co. rankings released Tuesday. Part one of the evil, child-murdering entity in Stephen King's "It" was fifth.

Alongside murder and mayhem, the top 10 was dominated by public sniping: ABC's season premiere of its occasional "Barbara Walters Special" series finished sixth, featuring actress Delta Burke's teary rekindling of her bitter feud with Linda Bloodworth-Thomason and Harry Thomason, producers of her hit situation comedy "Designing Women."

For the sixth time in the 9-week-old season, NBC's "Cheers" was television's most-watched show.

In overall network ratings, NBC was first with a 13.4 average. ABC was second with 13.3. CBS had 11.9. Each ratings point represents 931,000 television homes.

The CBS weekly newsmagazine "60 Minutes" was the No. 2 show. NBC's "A Different World" finished

'60 Minutes' to let 3 producers go

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS' "60 Minutes" will fire three producers at year's end, and ABC News will close its Frankfurt, Germany, bureau and three Central American offices, network officials said.

CBS will make the "60 Minutes" cuts to restructure the top-rated series' staff, not because of economic conditions that have forced what the network calls "a belt-tightening" in its news division,

a spokesman said. The move was ordered after Harry Reasoner, one of the show's first correspondents, announced he would reduce his workload, said Roy Brunett.

ABC, which last month said it would close its Chicago, Boston and Dallas bureaus, will close the Frankfurt bureau as part of an overseas reorganization, said a network executive who spoke on the condition of anonymity.

ABC declined to comment on the Frankfurt closing. The network also said it would expand its Moscow and Berlin bureaus as part of a reorganization of its overseas operations. About nine people will be let go because of the reorganization, an ABC official said.

ABC News said it also would close its offices in Panama, El Salvador, and Honduras, but keep its Nicaragua office open.

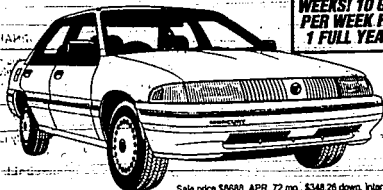

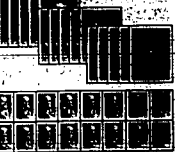
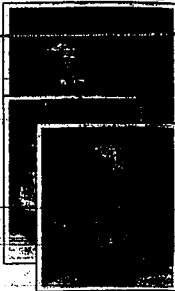
