Bush sure U.S. troops will be ready

WASHINGTON — President Bush Thursday dismissed reports that U.S. troops will not be ready to fight in the Persian Gulf until after Jan. 15 and expressed doubts that Iraq will withdraw from Kuwait by that U.N.-imposed deadline.

"Don't believe these reports you're reading," Bush said, referring to stories that his top military advisers have told him U.S. soldiers will not be ready for war until Feb. 1 at the earliest.

"It's under control," Bush told a handful of reporters he encountered in a White

House hallway after interrupting his Camp David holiday to spend six hours in Washington.

"The situation is exactly where I was told it was going to be at this time. Just right," Bush said. He repeated earlier statements that "absolutely, absolutely," allied forces would be ready to respond in 10 minutes if there were "clear provocation."

Meanwhile, a senior administration official said the administration believes Iraq President Saddam Hussein will make a diplomatic move or partially retreat from Kuwait by Jan. 15, thus forcing Bush to postpone a U.S. military assault.

Later, as Bush prepared to resume his holiday in the Mt. A-bad mountains, he said he was "very comfortable" with troop combat readiness after meeting Monday with Gen. Colin Powell, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Defense Secretary Dick Cheney. Bush also spoke by telephone with Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, commander of the 300,000 U.S. troops in Saudi Arabia.

Bush's remarks did little to uncrumble the ready-not-ready signals the administration has been sending since Dec. 19. Lt. Gen. Calvin A.H. Waller, Schwarzkopf's second-in-command, told reporters then that U.S. troops would not be fully pre-

pared for combat until after Feb. 1 and perhaps not until mid-February.

"That's a full month after the deadline set by the United Nations for the complete withdrawal of Iraqi forces from Kuwait. The U.N. resolution also authorized the use of military force to oust the Iraqis after that date.

"Asked if he thought Saddam could meet the deadline, Bush said, "Yes, I believe he can. I'm not sure I believe he will."

Was he prepared to compromise with Saddam? "No compromise on anything," Bush declared. "That's the problem. Everybody wants you to compromise."

Address grid given a push from county

BUIH. It's about five miles west and two miles south of town. Right past that clump of sagebrush on the left side of the road. Can't miss it.

By the way, the barn just caught fire. Please hurry.

Sounds far-fetched, and it is. But not by much. Trying to send firefighters to a home based on those directions is like playing word-matches in a haystack.

This is one reason why Twin Falls County is trying to get a new address system up and running. The system is based on a grid pattern that starts from the southwestern corner of the county.

In large part, the grid system is working. It can bring uniformity to the county and help not only in firefighting and delivering mail but also in planning and zoning, said Helen Phipps of the Twin Falls County Planning and Zoning Department.

But some seem to be resisting using the new system, she said.

"I'm not sure why people are resistant... Nobody likes change," Phipps said.

Kimberly and Hansen are using the new system, as are unincorporated areas on the eastern end of the county. Buhl and Hiler are next in line, with some of the new addressing in Buhl already finished, Phipps said.

But the transition in the county's west end has not been easy. Buhl Postmaster Tom Moore is reluctant to use the grid system, Phipps said.

Moore said he would be happy to use the grid system if the highway district would put up street signs. Without the signs, new addresses based on the grid system are almost useless, he said.

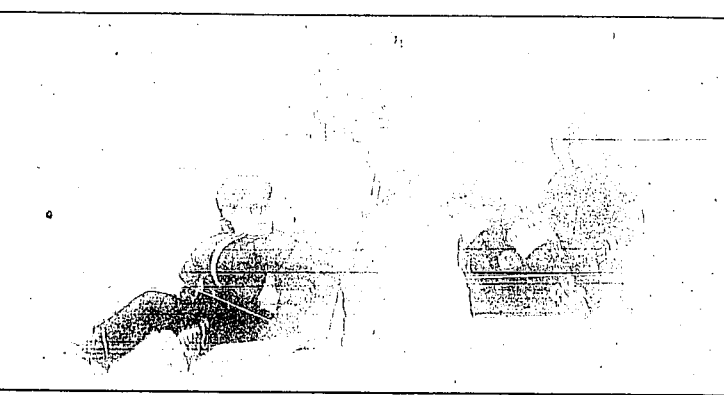
"It's not a matter of refusing to utilize the system. We are using and will use it," Moore said.

Houses are supposed to have new addresses based on the grid system, but it is hard to find those homes where there is not a street sign to give direction. Mail carriers generally go by the resident's name unless a home has the new address and there is a street sign to give some direction, Moore said.

Buhl Fire Chief Tom Owens said dispatchers generally give firefighters directions.

Jerome couple survives dip in frigid river near Atlanta

JEROME — Truman Arbaugh, 64, of Jerome, was in stable condition Thursday night at St. Luke's Hospital and is undergoing therapy treatments after he and his wife, Esther, 62, survived an icy plunge into Brown Creek over the weekend, thanks partly to a hunter who tracked them.

The couple was returning to their home in Jerome from Atlanta about 2:30 p.m. Saturday, on a primitive mountain road about 80 miles north of Boise when their car missed a curve due to heavy snow. The car left the road and rolled down a 30-foot embankment and into the water.

Esther Arbaugh was unable to release her seat belt. Her husband swam back twice to rescue his wife from the car, which landed in the river upside down.

The Arbaughs climbed back up the embankment to seek help.

The couple was exposed to the minus 35 degree weather for three hours and suffered third degree frostbite on their hands and feet.

Truman Arbaugh's cowboy boots filled with water and froze. The couple lost their hats and gloves in the accident.

Ron Shears, of Eagle, noticed the tail-lights of the Arbaugh vehicle in the river on his way home from hunting.

He noticed blood on the road and tracked the Arbaughs, who were headed toward an unoccupied cabin. Truman Arbaugh had fallen and couldn't get up.

Truman Arbaugh's frozen boots had to be cut off his feet. Shears gave them dry clothing and transported the couple to St. Luke's Hospital in Boise.

The couple arrived at the hospital at 11 p.m. that night.

Esther Arbaugh was later released.

States, cities criticize census

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Census Bureau's day-old population count came under "swift" criticism Thursday from a key congressman.

He and some state and local officials argued it had missed many urban Americans and would cost large cities federal funds.

The Bush administration official in charge of the census, Michael Dabry, defended it as "fair, fair and accurate."

Rep. Tom Sawyer, D-Ohio, chairman of the House census subcommittee, said the population count "may be the first one to be less accurate than its predecessor."

He noted the total was 4.7 million people below an estimate made in October, and added, "We're saying the apparent discrepancy is cause for concern."

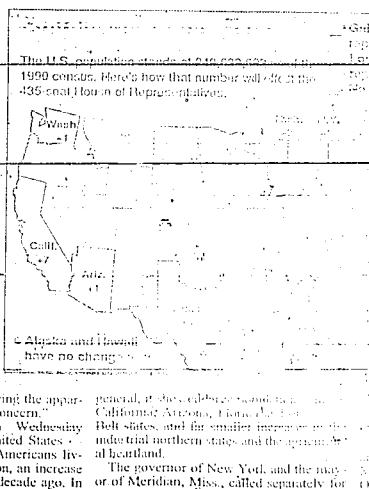
The count released on Wednesday pegged population in the United States, excluding nearly 1 million Americans living abroad — at 248.7 million, an increase of nearly 10 percent from a decade ago. In

general, it also added 1 million to California's total, 1.6 million to New York's, and 1 million to Michigan's. It also added 1 million to Texas' total, and 1 million to Florida's.

The governor of New York, and the mayors of New York City and of Meridian, Miss., called separately for

County should find a way to keep river stretch quiet

It's time for the area's muscle-motio mariners to paddle their own canoe.

Enthusiasts of non-motorized watercraft have argued persuasively that the new Centennial Waterfront Park is no place for motorboats. So Twin Falls County should let them provide the means of paying for the haven of quiet they want.

The idea is a fair and practical way for the county to solve the motorboat-vs.-canoe dilemma in which it finds itself.

Soon after the Twin Falls Rotary Club began its fund drive to buy land for the Snake River Canyon Park, grumblings arose over the potential for ski boats and other noisy craft in one of the Snake's last relatively pristine stretches.

Almost everyone liked the general idea of a park that allows public access to the river's picturesque Pillar Falls stretch. But canoeists and kayakers quickly became alarmed by the prospect of ski boats raising wakes and rackets in the narrow stretch of water.

The issue should have been addressed last summer. But county officials apparently ignored the grumblings until this month, when a too-long-delayed public hearing displayed the depth of feelings on the matter.

County officials made the right decision in appointing a community committee to look at the issue, though they were a bit late.

To tell the truth, the debate may be overblown. Chances are, even if motorboats are allowed at the park, few if any will use it. Other spots are more inviting.

Unfortunately, one or two motorboats (if driven by insensitive boaters) can ruin the water for everyone else.

The idea of reserving one small

stretch of river for slow-lane drivers is compelling. As any area's population grows, so does the need for a few quiet retreats from the noise and haste. Places where, if you squirt a little bit, you can imagine yourself discovering the landscape alongside William Clark and Meriwether Lewis.

You wouldn't want to lock up many places that way — it wouldn't be fair to taxpayers who are disabled or too old to paddle canoes, or even to taxpayers who simply prefer letting a motor do the work. Appropriately, most public waters in the Magic Valley are open to all kinds of use.

The Pillar Falls stretch, however, is an idea candidate for a peaceful exception.

The hitch in that idea is money. The county has handed a \$57,000 state grant to build the park. Since the state money comes from fuel taxes, the county can't use it for a park that excludes motorized craft.

So here's a suggestion for the new citizens committee and for county officials: Let the muscle-motio mariners find a way to replace the state money.

Presumably, a dock for canoes and such would cost somewhat less than facilities for boat trailers. Let's give the canoeists and raft-riders six months or so to raise \$50,000, or whatever figure seems right. If they succeed, they'll have proven that their cause has significant public support.

Once the substitute money is in hand, the county can designate the park for whatever uses seem acceptable. Banning all motor craft may not be necessary; electric trolling motors or small outboards probably wouldn't be troublesome.

They key is that local officials would have authority over those decisions. The state money is a straitjacket the county should try to shed.



Latest Quayle joke just isn't funny

WASHINGTON — No, this isn't the latest Dan Quayle joke. It's true.

On New Year's Day, according to a White House announcement, U.S. troops in the Saudi Arabian desert will receive a visit and a pep talk from Vice President Dan Quayle.

It's no joke, but sending Quayle to exhort troops to battle is one of Desert Shield's more bizarre ideas. Somehow a gung-ho, hit-and-run speech to the troops by a vice president who used his wealthy family's clout to sit out the Vietnam War does not strike me as a morale builder.

What's Quayle going to do, echo the president's threat that Saddam Hussein "will get his ass kicked"?

Sure, the troops will applaud Quayle politely. He's brass. But anybody who's spent time around infantrymen or Marines can't imagine the sardonic comments along the chow lines.

These guys can't buy a beer. Can't celebrate Christmas publicly. Can't flaunt a pin-up. Can't get a glimpse of Brooke Shields in a slit skirt.

So for compensation they get a we're-in-this-together exhortation from Quayle, who

skipped the draft by joining the Indiana National Guard and fighting what wags call "The Battle of Kokomo."

If administration insiders think they'll rebuild Quayle's image with TV film of the Vice president's rations with field troops, they're misguided. If anything, the scenes will revive the 1988 campaign rhetoric over Quayle's use of family pressure to duck the Army.

Quayle, by his account, had passed the physical in 1969 and was ripe for the draft. He had his parents contact an ex-National Guard commander who owned the editor of the family's newspaper. He then spent six months in a popular Indiana guard unit writing press releases.

I don't agree with critics who label politicians who sat out Vietnam and now aggressively talk of attacking Iraq — Rep. Steve Solarz, D-N.Y., Rep. Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., and even Defense Secretary Dick Cheney are mentioned — as "chicken hawks."

When Quayle, though, makes saber-rat-

ting speeches about flattening Saddam Hussein, they sound as funny as Woody Allen threatening to bust Mike Tyson.

And Quayle as a war-making expert is not exactly Karl von Clausewitz. On ABC's "Nightline," arguing that Vietnam is no parallel to a Persian Gulf war, Quayle analyzed, "Vietnam is a jungle. You had jungle warfare. Kuwait, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, you have sand."

Obviously Quayle's handlers want to expose him on TV among Desert Shield troops to stifle a "Dump Dan" movement in 1992. (Ironically, the long-shot replacement for Quayle on the '92 ticket is Pentagon commander Gen. Colin Powell.) But repackaging Quayle is a tough sell. In a recent NBC/Wall Street Journal poll, 69 percent said the thought of Quayle as president makes them

"uncomfortable."

Is this real life or a Doonesbury strip? Matter of fact, posing the Boy Vee as a desert warrior IS the latest Dan Quayle joke. But it's not funny.

We don't know how he managed it, but he got a driver's license. We were completely dismayed, as were all our co-workers.

We called the Gooding County Driver's License Bureau before our friend's untimely death and asked them if they realized what they had done. The bureau insisted that they did. We also contacted Health and Welfare and they said they help these people get their driver's licenses. Also, we contacted Refugee Services regarding Valentin's incompetent driving just a couple of days after he received his license. They told us they could not get involved. We thought they were already involved!

Valentin is gone now and we can tell you why. He didn't understand the complexities of our traffic control system. He woefully lacked the driving experience necessary to acquire a driver's license and he went to an incompetent driver's license bureau in Gooding County that gave him the power to fill himself — or even worse, someone else.

Security Council reproach of Israel is hypocritical

There they were again, the standard bearers of international morality, voting 15-0 to rebuke Israel for ordering the deportation of four Palestinians, what's more, they instructed the United Nations should monitor the treatment of Arabs in the West Bank and Gaza.

The U.N. Security Council members were in all their hypocritical splendor.

There was Great Britain, which for some reason did not also move that the United Nations patrol the streets of Derry or Belfast to check out the treatment of the occupied Irish.

There was Malaysia, whose delegates do not ask that East River paragon of the double standard to monitor how it treats ethnic Chinese.

There was Cuba. Need one add anything here?

There was the United States, struggling to preserve its alliance of convenience with the feudal, broked Arab monarchies and the terrorist Hater Assad, telling its real ally that democracy means nothing. And no, the U.S. delegation did not urge the United Nations to monitor the treatment of dying black babies in the concentration camps of apartheid South Africa.

What there wasn't was Israel, for Israel is not allowed to occupy a seat on the Security Council.

Israel contends it is deporting the four Palestinians because they are leaders of a Muslim fundamentalist outfit, Hamas, which has a fairly simple policy on Israel. It wants to wipe it out.

Two Hamas members are believed to have been stabbed to death three Israeli civilians, two men and a woman. One victim was then quoted, another was executed, the third was almost beheaded.

The Security Council had the right to monitor Hamas. The deportation of four Palestinians turns the world community on its head, the number of three Israeli, fail to keep the diplomats from expressing a fit of pique and taking a dip in the heated pool at the U.N. Plaza Hotel or heading a few 500 yards to dine on Sechuan food.

So, the United States, struggling to preserve its alliance of convenience with the feudal, broked Arab monarchies and the terrorist Hater Assad, telling its real ally that democracy means nothing. And no, the U.S. delegation did not urge the United Nations to monitor the treatment of dying black babies in the concentration camps of apartheid South Africa.

What there wasn't was Israel, for Israel is not allowed to occupy a seat on the Security Council.

It is as simple as pie and, as such, there is much that is by no means in the very corridors of the U.N. building.

But at times, it is crucial to point to what should be obvious, and what is too often obvious is the underlying hypocrisy that passes for diplomacy in the Middle East.

The Security Council also condemned Israel in 1981 for taking out the Iraqi nuclear reactor. Condemned? The council should have sponsored Israel for the Nobel Peace Prize. It was then, and now, that while diplomats condemned publicly, they offered prayers of thanks privately to the Security Council.

Interestingly, there has been no Security Council rebuke this year of the Hindu-Muslim Sikh slaughterhouse activity in India or any resolution to investigate the allegations that Sri Lanka's military killed Lebanese Christian warlords after the latter surrendered. Just two Palestinian guerrillas or terrorists, or tourists, or somebody, but Israel with 50 border and rocket attacks. Israelis note that the Security Council offered no condemnation.

Once all stands, the United Nations to blame before the bar of its justice the Khmer Rouge sponsors of the Cambodian holocaust or the Chinese who ordered armor and artillery to sweep Tiananmen Square of unarmed students.

It is not clear how Israel treats the Palestinians, would it be like land given to a group on Syria and check on the 3,000 Jews who are allowed to emigrate, vote, run for office, receive unassisted mail from overseas or work for the government? Some have been tortured, jailed and killed.

Should the world hear of a Syrian from there, a bank or a journal or a radio station, "it would be a good idea."

But the world has what it is allowed to hear about Israel. It is about anything, but not about the way Israel treats the Palestinians.

It is not clear how Israel treats the Palestinians, would it be like land given to a group on Syria and check on the 3,000 Jews who are allowed to emigrate, vote, run for office, receive unassisted mail from overseas or work for the government? Some have been tortured, jailed and killed.

Should the world hear of a Syrian from there, a bank or a journal or a radio station, "it would be a good idea."

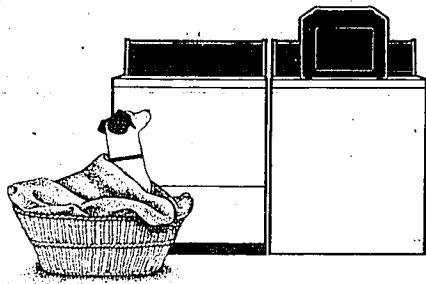

Boise forest will issue use permit

BOISE (AP) — Boise National Forest Supervisor Dave Rittersbaecher said Thursday that he would issue a special-use permit allowing the start of work on a "master development plan" for the proposed Valhalla Resort.

Issuance of the permit, which Rittersbaecher said still depends on similar action by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, would give Valhalla Corp. one year to prepare a master plan for the Valley County project that would be Idaho's largest resort development since Sun Valley was built in the 1930s.

100 miles north of Boise. The resort would include 925 acres of ski runs with eight four- or six-person lifts and a gondola, an equestrian center, ice rink, health and fitness center, 18-hole golf course, marina, condominiums, international hotels and dozens of shops.

Developers say Valhalla would be a world-class destination resort creating hundreds of jobs and increasing the county's population by as much as 75 percent from its current 6,900 residents.

If the U.S. Forest Service accepts the master plan, which Rittersbaecher said could cost up to \$5 million to complete, Valhalla will be required to begin work within six months and complete the project within three years.

"I'm pleased we're going to have the opportunity to move ahead," said Dennis Taggart, a Boise architect and chairman of Valhalla Inc., the operating subsidiary of Valhalla.

The proposed \$100 million resort near Donnelly would use 2,800 acres of public land for ski trails and other additions in the densely timbered West Mountain area on Cascade Reservoir, about

Besides national forest land, the project would include about 75 acres of Bureau of Reclamation property along Cascade Reservoir that would be used for summer recreation facilities including a marina, restaurant, hotel and tennis courts.

The potential impact of the Valhalla proposal has divided Valley County. Some residents and landowners contend the project will bring the area a long-needed economic boost, while others fear it will endanger the environment and the area's rural lifestyle.

The project is proposed by Taggart, Pierre Schneebelen, president of PSI Resorts based in Paris and a veteran resort developer.

Corporate tax slide depresses state revenues

BOISE (AP) — Receipts from Idaho's corporate income tax skidded further behind expectations in November, but Andrus administration analysts indicated it was as much a result of tax overpayments last year as a dimming national business picture.

Continued solid personal income and sales tax collections coupled with significantly higher earnings on invested state funds partially offset the lagging corporate tax receipts. But overall revenues for the spending year that began July 1 remained \$3.1 million below the Nov. 30 projection.

Gov. Cecil Andrus said earlier this month he believed the economy would perform even better than that. But economists were heartened by the cash being generated from the personal income tax, a key indicator of the economy's underlying strength.

"Despite national trends, indications of a relatively strong Christmas selling season suggest this category should enter 1991 in a position of strength," they said.

Revenues from the corporate taxes fell \$4 million short of projections for November, pushing collections for the first five months of the current state budget year \$10.4 million below the five-month benchmark. Sizeable refunds were blamed for much of the "one-month" shortfall, and economists said the situation has

been building since summer as corporations that apparently overpaid their taxes in 1989 were using those credits to reduce 1990 payments. Corporate tax revenues last year were \$6.5 million higher than state lawmakers anticipated.

Those receipts stood \$3.5 million ahead of expectations through November, largely due to payroll withholding which accounts for the

bulk of income tax revenues. "Strong Idaho employment gains enjoyed in recent months translate directly into these positive wage earnings," analysts said.

State allows 2 utilities to reduce home incentives

BOISE (AP) — State regulators have approved reductions in the incentives two utilities offer for new homes built to energy efficient standards.

Under the 1991 incentives program, Utah Power & Light will pay \$1,350 instead of \$1,500 for the energy-saving measures used in construction of new single-family homes and \$225 instead of \$500 per unit on multi-family dwellings.

Pacific Power's single-family residence incentive will drop from \$1,250 to \$1,125 and from \$500 to \$250 per unit for multi-family dwellings. Buyers of Super Good Cents single family homes will receive \$400 instead of \$600.

Both Utah Power and Pacific Power were authorized earlier this year to expand their incentive programs to manufactured housing. Utah Power is offering a \$3,000 incentive while Pacific Power's incentive is \$2,500.

Labor council unhappy with Bacon appointment

POCATELLO (AP) — The Pocatello Central Labor Council has expressed "outrage and disappointment" over the recent appointment of Bill Bacon to succeed Attorney General-elect Larry EchoHawk as Bannock County prosecutor.

Wright and Secretary-Treasurer Sam Nettinga, it said. "Our outrage is over the fact you totally disregard the input of the entire review committee."

A committee named by the Bannock County Commission to review the Democratic Central Committee's three nominees for the job blasted the commissioners earlier for rejecting the committee's top choice, Deputy Prosecutor Dean Trimmer.

Trimmer later was named Pocatello city attorney.

Wright said he has no problem with Bacon, who appears well qualified for the job. But by overlooking the review committee's unanimous choice, the commissioners made "the political blunder of 1990."

Promise could cost \$120,000

POCATELLO (AP) — A letter written by former Mayor Dick Finlayson promising an ex-city employee a job once he was released from prison could end up costing Pocatello almost \$120,000.

But city officials have confirmed that the August 1989 letter from Finlayson is the basis of McGill's lawsuit. The letter was written shortly after McGill pleaded guilty to two felony counts of molesting young girls.

Eddie McGill, a former sanitation department worker, is seeking that much in a lawsuit filed this month in 6th District Court. McGill contends the city did not fulfill the promise Finlayson made last year.

Commissioner Val Arvas said she was disappointed by the council's stand.

Mayor Peter Angstadt and Pocatello City Council members have declined comment on the complaint or the progress toward reaching an out-of-court settlement.

Thaw loosens pipe fittings, dampens bank driveway

The minor mishap caused no damage to the building, but portions of the concrete driveway will be rebuilt after the ground thaws, said Debbie Luckey, marketing director for the mall.

The bank branch was without water until Wednesday, when a fitting arrived from Salt Lake City.

2 juveniles lead police on high-speed chase over ice

ALBION — Two Twin Falls juveniles were arrested near Pomerelle Ski Area and charged with stealing a snowboard after a chase that reached speeds of more than 60 miles per hour over icy roads.

Cassia County Sheriff's Deputy Bruce Bristol chased the two 17-year-old boys down Pomerelle Road and onto Idaho Highway 77 before the boys pulled over and tried to hide near the Colner Creek Store, Lt. Jim Higgins of the Cassia County Sheriff's Department said.

During the chase, the boys tossed the snowboard out the window of their pickup up, Higgins said. When police returned to the scene later, the board had been picked up. Higgins asked that anyone who knows of the snowboard's whereabouts call the sheriff's office.

Each boy was charged with one count of grand theft, one count of petit theft and with eluding a police officer, Higgins said. The driver was also cited reckless driving and for not having proof of insurance.

The boys were released to their parents and will be notified by court officials when they are to appear.

State is seeking seasonal park aides and lifeguards

BOISE — The Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation is faking applications for seasonal park aide and lifeguard positions for 1991.

Snowmobilers and others to follow new regulations

BOISE — A new state law that requires titles for snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, and off-road motorbikes will take effect Tuesday.

Titles will become mandatory for all transfers of ownership. Upon purchase, the new owner must apply for a title.

Applicants must be able to provide proof of ownership when they apply for titles. Acceptable proof of ownership include manufacturer's certificate of origin, manufacturer's statement of origin, or other dealer documents, a receipt or a bill of sale.

Vehicles purchased after July 1, 1988, will require verification of sales tax payment before a title can be issued.

3 months later, investigation is nearly done

JEROME — State officials are still investigating four separate incidents at the now-defunct Southern Idaho Youth Center east of here, nearly three months after the center closed.

Mike Burgess of the Idaho Department of Investigation said Thursday he is still looking into an alleged rape and three other incidents at the juvenile detention center.

Burgess said he hopes his investigation will be completed by mid-January. The state will give its report to Jerome County Prosecutor John Horgan, who will decide

whether criminal charges will be filed.

Horgan said Thursday that he had received no recent word on the status of the state's investigation other than a memo from Burgess three weeks ago saying the state was still looking into the matter.

"We're making progress," Burgess said. His office has conducted more than 20 interviews so far and will probably do at least 10 more, he said.

The juvenile center came under scrutiny in June when a female inmate filed a tort claim alleging she was raped by another inmate while at the center.

Also in June, co-owner John Devine and

his wife, Rose, struggled with two combative female detainees.

The center's former administrator, Bill Amoureux, accused Devine of physically abusing the girls, but Devine denied using excessive force in the incident.

The detention center closed at the end of September after the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare said it planned to revoke the center's license.

When he announced the decision in August, Health and Welfare regional director David Davis cited several reasons including high staff turnover, the use of padlocks on bedroom doors, the lack of a qualified

administrator and a fight at the center that left one youth with a dislocated shoulder.

The fact that the youths involved in the incidents being investigated are no longer at the center has slowed the Bureau of Investigation's probe, Burgess said.

Some are in foster homes and others have left the area, he said.

In addition, several "high-priority" cases pushed the juvenile center investigation to the back burner, Burgess said.

"It's taken a little longer than we thought," he said. "But this is going to be a high priority now."

Jerome gets answer: Well water is pure

City will now accept the donation of 2 wells by Spears

JEROME — Water from wells at the Spears Manufacturing plant is pure and drinkable, according to test results received by city officials.

Larry Paine, Jerome's city administrator, said there is no sign of contamination from toxic wastes dumped on the soil near the wells by Tupperware operations.

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, Bureau of Laboratories tested the wells for the city.

Spears is donating two wells, storage tanks, a pumping system and water rights to the city of Jerome.

The additional water from the wells is needed to supply businesses in the growing industrial park south of Jerome and for city use when necessary, Paine said.

The city had decided to put a decision on whether to accept Spears' donation on hold until after the water had been tested and proven satisfactory for domestic use.

Our biggest problem now is meeting Health and Welfare requirements, Paine said.

"They weren't in on the wells at the beginning because it was a private thing, but now when the water will be used for municipal purposes, there's all kinds of things we have to do," he said.

The City Council will formally accept the water system at a council meeting after all the paper work is done, he said.

It's now 9 cents less at the pump

TWIN FALLS — Gasoline at the pumps has fallen nearly 9 cents a gallon since the week before Christmas, the biggest weekly drop in prices since Iraq invaded Kuwait, the American Automobile Association said Thursday.

Nationwide, self-service unleaded regular cost an average of \$1.282 a gallon this week, an AAA survey of stations nationwide showed. That's 8.9 cents lower than the price on Dec. 18, and the lowest since a gallon of gas cost \$1.273 on Sept. 5.

The average price of self-service unleaded gas in Idaho was \$1.301 on Wednesday, AAA said. In the Magic Valley, it ranged from \$1.219 in Wendell to \$1.269 in Burley, \$1.299 in Twin Falls, \$1.359 in Hailey and \$1.599 in Ketchum.

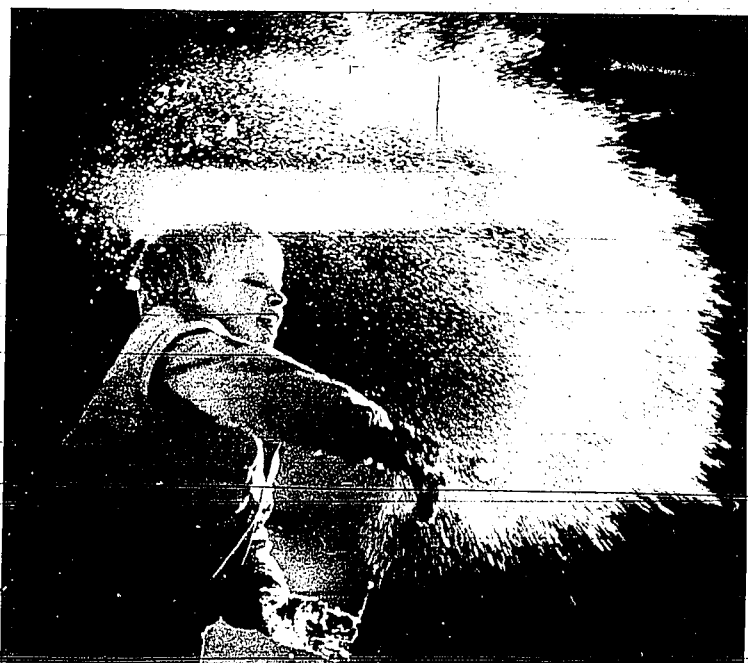
Oil and gasoline prices have been volatile since Iraq invaded Kuwait on Aug. 2. Persian Gulf countries produce a substantial portion of the world's crude oil, and any disruption of supplies likely would cause prices to soar.

But prices have been moderating since mid-October on increased prospects for peace in the Gulf. Oil buyers also had been worried about a glut of oil, because users have reduced consumption and oil-producers have accelerated their output to make up for the loss of oil from Iraq and Kuwait.

AAA said prices also fell this week for high grades of gasoline. The average price for a gallon of mid-grade unleaded

Broken sprinkler system means long night for firefighters at Kimberly care center

Although one room was severely damaged, no residents will be displaced, King said. Workers should have the affected area cleaned up by noon today and all the residents will be back in their own rooms as soon as the repairs are complete, he said.

Stallings joins senators in blasting reintroduction panel

IDAHOO FALLS — Democratic Congressman Richard Stallings has joined Idaho's two Republican senators in blasting the make-up of a committee studying reintroduction of wolves into central Idaho and the Yellowstone National Park area, saying the state was being shortchanged.

"I think it's a terrible panel," Stallings said on Thursday. "I think it's wrong. Idaho should be represented."

State Fish and Game Director Jerry Conley was the only Idaho represented on the 10-member panel when it was announced last week, and Sen. Steve Symms and Sen. elect Larry Craig quickly asked Democratic

Gov. Cecil Andrus pull Conley back until Idaho representation is increased.

Stallings, claiming the state should have at least five representatives from environmental and livestock groups, promised to ask Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan to reconsider the committee's composition.

The group is charged with drafting a wolf reintroduction and management plan for presentation to Congress by May 15.

Stallings said he had been deferring to Idaho's GOP Senate contingent on the wolf issue in the belief it would have more influence with a Republican administration.

But he maintained the lack of recognition on the wolf reintroduction committee was an effect of the retirement of James Mc-

Clure next week.

Although Craig is succeeding McClure, Stallings said the Interior Department seems more concerned with getting the support of Republican lawmakers in Montana and Wyoming. Montana has three delegates on the committee while Wyoming has two members.

A supporter of McClure's unsuccessful bid to reintroduce wolves in Idaho and Yellowstone, Stallings expressed concern that haggling over the committee will slow the effort down.

"I think you will see a delay way beyond the 15th of May, perhaps by as much as a year," he said.

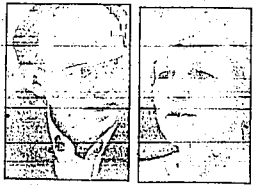
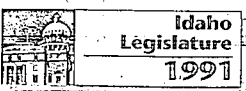

"We've been an importer of physicians in this state for many years and the number of physicians available for import into Idaho is shrinking very fast," Newcomb said.

"We're going to have to educate our own

students to fill that gap."

While Idaho can't afford its own medical school, Newcomb said, it can take advantage of a program called WAMI — Wash-

ington, Alaska, Montana, Idaho — at the University of Washington. Idaho currently has 15 WAMI seats and used to have 20.

"I think we could probably go upwards of 30 ... or we're really going to run into a rural health care problem with no physicians," he said.

Newcomb also sees a loan-forgiveness program as an incentive to draw doctors into Idaho. Ideally, he doesn't want to restrict the program to Idaho students.

"If you're really going to use that loan mechanism to attract rural physicians, then you're going to have to expand the pools," Newcomb said. "You really want a doc. You don't care if he's from Massachusetts."

Some oppose air force plan

CEDAR CITY, Utah (AP) - The Air Force is running into opposition from both environmentalists and peace activists over plans for a training route through southern Utah wilderness study areas and increased night flights in the western desert.

The Utah Wilderness Association is rallying its membership against the Air Force's proposed training route along the Green River through Desolation Canyon and past Capitol Reef National Park and Fish Lake National Forest.

The planned route begins near Ouray along the Green River, travels south through Desolation Canyon, then veers southwest across the northern San Rafael, past Capitol Reef National Park and Fish Lake National Forest, crosses Notch Peak and the House Range before joining with existing West Desert routes.

In all, nine wilderness study areas and several potential wild and scenic rivers would be directly affected along the route, the UWA complains.

While the Air Force plans an environmental assessment on the proposed corridor, the UWA wants a full-scale environmental impact statement — and a series of public hearings.

Gary Macfarlane, conservation director for the UWA, said Wednesday that his group doesn't think an environmental analysis is adequate considering the probable impacts to wildlife, recreation, tourism and cultural resources the bomber corridor will have.

Goodwin resigns as 9th circuit chief

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Chief Judge Alfred Goodwin says he will step down Jan. 31 as head of the nine-state 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, the nation's largest federal appellate court.

Goodwin said Wednesday he would transfer to senior status, with a reduced workload. That will create a vacancy on the 28-judge court for President Bush to fill.

He was appointed to the court in 1971 by President Richard Nixon after nine years on the Oregon Supreme Court and two years as a U.S. District Court judge in Wednesday that his chief judge, he took over for Browning in successfully lobbying Congress against a renewed effort by Pacific Northwest lawmakers to split the circuit into two courts.

Goodwin, 67, has been chief judge since June 1988, when he succeeded James Browning. He will be replaced by Judge J. Clifford Wallace, who is next in order of seniority.

Goodwin could have remained chief judge until age 70, but said he wanted to spend less time as an administrator, which has occupied about half his time, and more time deciding cases and being with his family.

The effort was prompted by complaints from the timber industry.

Judge refuses state post-conviction relief

LEWISTON (AP) - A self-proclaimed Satan-worshipper convicted of multiple slayings in a Lewiston woman has been denied a shot at a trial.

Robert L. Brown is serving a fixed life sentence plus two 15-year terms for raping and stabbing the 25-year-old woman in a downtown office building in 1989.

Lewiston attorney Lee Sims contended in the petition that Brown, then 24, was not adequately represented by Jeff Brudie, a public defender.

Brudie withdrew after Brown complained about the representation repeatedly, including in a letter to Schilling.

Sims stated in the petition Brudie advised Brown the maximum penalty he could receive was 15 years in prison, and that he could withdraw his guilty plea, or he would receive a 15-year sentence.

Brudie also did not attempt to present certain evidence, which was legally obtained, from being presented in court, the petition said.

Questioned Wednesday by Nez Perce County Prosecutor Steven Tolson, Brudie said that the evidence was collected by serving search warrants, and he felt there was no basis for challenging their validity.

"A manic-depressive who is having a bad time, we don't have a facility or any place to put them," McRoberts said. "If they're put in jail, they have to wait for a court hearing, which could be 72 hours or longer. They can't be committed anywhere until they're desperate. (And) if they could have been medicated at the very outset, they never would have been imprisoned in the first place."

She hopes to develop local resources, such as contracts with hospitals for bed space. But not all changes will cost money, she said.

"I don't think we have to (spend money) to change the commitment laws. It's going to cost money in areas — to have facilities contract out or to have short-term facilities — we need a 72-hour facility."

"To be able to put them into State Hospital South, (they) almost have to be at the point of committing suicide to even get in and it's just because of our laws are really outdated," McRoberts said.

McRoberts, a member of the Sen-

Aggies won't change defense for Detmer

SAN DIEGO — Texas A&M isn't going to change its defense when it faces No. 13 Brigham Young and Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer in Saturday's Holiday Bowl.

The Aggies still plan to blitz extensively, even though Detmer has usually picked apart defenses which rely on an all-out rush and man-to-man coverage.

"That's been our style for a long time. They know good and well what's going to happen," Texas A&M coach R.C. Stocum said. "It's like having lighted sticks of dynamite. You pass them back and forth and hope they go off in your favor."

Detmer, though, has had a dynamic season in leading the Cougars to a 10-2 record and becoming the first Western Athletic Conference player to win the Heisman. He passed for an NCAA-record 5,188 yards and 41 touchdowns while completing 64.2 percent of his passes.

Yet Detmer is wary of an Aggies defense which allowed a Southwest Conference low of 5.9 yards per pass attempt and recorded 35 sacks. Opposing quarterbacks completed just 51.4 percent of their passes for seven touchdowns against Texas A&M (8-3-1), which also had 12 interceptions.

"I lived down there and know about their tradition," said Detmer, whose family resides in San Antonio. "This will be tougher for us than a lot of people might think. They like to blitz. If we're able to pick up the blitz, we'll be successful."

The Aggies are by two all-Southwest Conference players — cornerback Kevin Smith and linebacker William Thomas. Smith, a junior, already is tied for the conference record with 18 interceptions. Thomas has 13 sacks.

"If we're going to win, we're going to have to get after Detmer," Thomas said. "The way to stop him is to not let him have a lot of time to pick you apart. We're going to try not to give him as much time as we've seen him get on film."

Thomas said that Detmer compares favorably with Houston's David Klingler, who led the Cougars to a 36-31 victory over the Aggies on Oct. 13. Klingler completed 24 of 51 passes for 352 yards and one touchdown that day while being intercepted twice. "Detmer is a lot more mobile than Klingler," Thomas said.

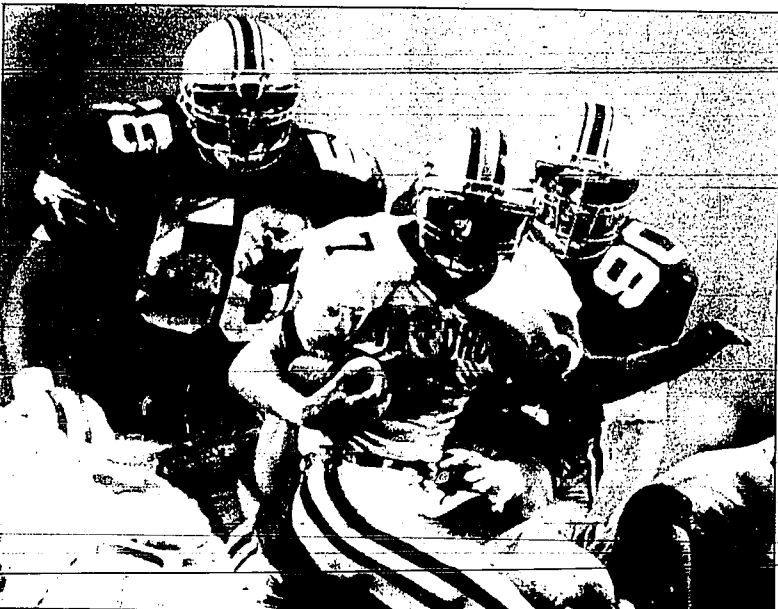

Underdog Air Force surprises Ohio State with quick defense, key plays

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Rob Perez scored twice on short runs and Carlton McDonald returned a pass interception 40 yards for a touchdown Thursday night as Air Force upset No. 24 Ohio State 23-11 in the Liberty Bowl.

Air Force (7-5), a 17-point underdog, had built a 13-5 lead on a pair 1-yard TD runs by Perez. Then, after Ohio State (7-4-1) got back within two points, McDonald put the game away with his second interception of the game.

Despite having a weight advantage of about 50 pounds a man along the line of scrimmage, Ohio State had trouble throughout trying to run against the quicker Air Force defense.

Record-setting Favre in final game tonight

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — For Brett Favre, it ends where it all began.

After four years of chills, thrills and more good times than bad, Southern Mississippi's quarterback ends his college career at Legion Field in tonight's All American Bowl against North Carolina State.

Favre, a starter since the third game of his freshman season, didn't see action here in 1987 against Alabama.

"I didn't want to play in that game," he said. "We were getting our butts kicked."

But he's been a fixture since. He came off the bench the next week, leading Southern Mississippi to a 31-24 win over Tulane, and a career was born.

Since then, Favre has set 16 school records in leading the Golden Eagles to a 27-15 record in his 42 starts.

He has led wins over Alabama, Auburn and Florida State, and as his career comes to an end, Favre has a chance to pass 8,000 passing yards. He needs 305 yards against a tough Wolfpack secondary.

Whether another record comes Friday, his career has exceeded expectations.

"Oh, there's no doubt about that," said Irvin Favre, his father and coach at Hancock North Central High School. "We've been very pleased with his performance."

Favre's future looked bleak in mid-July when one car accident nearly took his life. Internal injuries lingered, and Favre underwent surgery in August. He missed Southern's season-opening 12-0 victory over Delta State, but was back on Sept. 9 to lead Southern to a 27-24 victory over Alabama, ranked 23rd at the time.

The elder Favre said his son's return was a family decision.

"A lot of it was our decision, but (coach) Curley (Hallman) had the final say," Irvin Favre said. "We never considered a redshirt. If he would have gone past the Mississippi State game we'd probably, but then we would have asked for and probably been granted a redshirt."

No redshirt was necessary. In his first three seasons, Favre threw for 6,000 yards and 44 touchdowns. "I just wanted to come back and help this team win," the quarterback said.

"At times I wasn't the old Brett, but just being out there, just having the opportunity to be with these guys and win was great."

It was also different. The numbers were down — 1,577 yards and seven touchdowns — and just one did Favre pass for more than 200 yards in a game.

None of that matters to Jeff Bower, Favre's friend and mentor, who was named to replace Hallman.

"I've been fortunate since I've been coaching to be around some fine quarterbacks, and he comes to the top," Bower said. "He's a great player, but the thing I appreciate most is his football mind. When you're talking to him, he understands what you're talking about."

"To have the opportunity for his last game to be my first as a head coach is very special to me," Bower said.

"It's also a special time for Brett Favre. The career I've had here... I wouldn't trade it for anything else," he said. "Southern's not the great football capital of the world. It's no Notre Dame or Miami type of team, but we're a family and we get along great."

"I've grown up with the seniors on this team. We've gone to two bowl games, and we've been successful in one. Hopefully we can be successful in one more."

4 teams sagged big time in NFL this year

"Who's gonna win the Super Bowl?" the guys ask. This is about teams which 17 weeks ago were given a chance to win the Super Bowl and won't. And WHY.

Holdouts are one reason — Kevin Greene and half the Rams' linebackers; Keith Jackson of the Eagles, who started 2-4, blowing all but their wild-card chances; Don Majkowski of Green Bay, and most of Cleveland's linebackers. But the Giants had seven defensive starters hold out, and Lawrence Taylor didn't show up until three days before the opener — yet they're 12-3.

Green Bay and Detroit each are 6-9. They were expected to be better this year. Especially the Packers, who they played 6 last year. But that's when they played a last-place schedule and had got four last-minute wins from Majkowski.

The following are the real disappointments — teams that were supposed to have Super Bowl potential, and didn't:

Los Angeles Rams (5-10)
These guys went to the NFC title

game last year and were viewed as the second best team in football entering the season. "The key," John Robinson said in training camp, "is how the young guys play."

The Rams took many of their young guys with the draft choices they got in the Eric Dickerson trade. No good. Cleveland's Gary showed promise as a running back; he also has fumbled 11 times.

Some got hurt, but the key was Greene's holdout. He was going to be a defensive end in the new 4-3 but never got the work in.

Minnesota (6-9)
Everything seemed wonderful with a team that for the last two years has had more Pro Bowlers than anyone and was a prohibitive favorite to win the NFC Central. Everyone got signed, and Mike Lynn, the general manager, took everyone to a preseason happiness camp in New Mexico to get rid of the bad vibes that had plagued everyone the year before.

Then came the third game of the season — a 19-16 loss in Chicago in which quarterback Wade Wilson went down with a fractured thumb. Then, Keith Millard, the NFL's best defensive player a year ago, tore up a knee and was lost for the season.

That was the first of five straight losses by a total of 35 points, leaving the Vikings at 1-6. Rich Gannon looked OK in Wilson's place at quarterback, but Herschel Walker was a mystery, even with four guys (Jerry Burns, Mark Trestman, Tom Moore and Bob Schelker) calling the plays instead of Schelker alone.

Then came Lynn's resignation to head the new World League, five straight wins, Walker's semi-emergence and a shot at a playoff spot.

But the Vikings folded in the fourth quarter and lost to the Giants at the Meadowlands, lost two more and...

Wait! It's next year. **Denver (4-11)**
The 55-10 blowout at the Super Bowl started the decline — you could feel it in training camp.

It only got worse. Coach Dan Reeves missed 10 days with a heart ailment, and injuries hit almost as soon as the season started, knocking out three-fourths of the secondary at one time. Early in the season they lost to Buffalo, despite dominating in statistics, then, lost at home 30-29 to horrible Cleveland on a last-second field goal — those two defeats were the first two of nine in

10 games, creating a depression in Denver.

Closing three AFC title games to Denver in four seasons finally did the Browns in — the guy who got the most time on Browns highlight (low-light) clips every Sunday was owner Art Modell, looking disgusted (or walking out of the owner's box).

This one was predictable. The Browns lost both offensive tackles to retirement in training camp, the linebackers were holdouts, everyone was aging, and recent drafts had been bad (Mike Junkin, Clifford Charlton, Lawyer Tillman). There was also the trade of Earnest Byner to Washington for Mike Oliphant ("My biggest regret," said the hands-on Modell). Coach Bud Carson knew the problem ("I can't win with this offensive line," he said in training camp). Carson was gone after the ninth week, replaced for the interim by Jim Shofner.

The culmination came last week when the Browns fumbled the ball on each of their first three offensive plays in a 35-0 loss to Pittsburgh that was 35-0 only because the Steelers stopped playing offense in the second half.

Bowden hoping for win at last against Paterno

MIAMI (AP) — Florida State coach Bobby Bowden has known Joe Paterno for nearly 30 years, played against his teams 10 times and is still looking for his first victory over the Penn State coach.

Bowden hopes the sixth-ranked Seminoles can end his personal jinx Friday when they tangle with Paterno's seventh-ranked Nittany Lions in the inaugural Blockbuster Bowl at Joe Robbie Stadium.

Both teams bring 9-2 records into the game matching the nation's two winningest major college coaches.

"I'd like Florida State to beat Penn State, more than Bobby Bowden beat Joe Paterno," Bowden said. "We're not going to play."

The Blockbuster Bowl features the first matchup in a dozen years between coaches with more than 200 victories. Two late greats, Bear Bryant and Woody Hayes, were on opposite sidelines when Alabama and Ohio State played in the 1978 Sugar Bowl.

Actually, Bowden is 0-6 as a head coach against Paterno, losing all six times when he coached at West Virginia. The other four defeats came while Bowden was an assistant at West Virginia.

"We haven't even scratched," said Bowden, who has 204 coaching victories in 25 years and a 9-3-1 bowl record, best among coaches with at least 10 bowl appearances.

"He (Bowden) didn't have a lot of luck against us because we had better players up here than he did," Paterno said. "I think he has proven what kind of a coach he is, when he has gotten comparable materials as he has at Florida State."

During a media luncheon a few weeks ago, Paterno said he may have jumped the gun in persuading

Bowden into a Penn State-Florida State bowl matchup. At the time, the Seminoles hadn't beaten a ranked team.

But then they demolished once-beaten Florida 45-30 in the season finale.

The only previous Penn State-Florida State meeting was a 17-17 tie in the 1967 Gator Bowl. Florida State's Grant Guthrie kicked a 32-yard field goal in the final seconds to clinch a comeback from a 17-0 halftime deficit.

Paterno was an assistant at Penn State when he met Bowden for the first time in 1962.

Bowden, then the coach of Howard College — in Birmingham, Ala., had traveled to State College, Pa., to meet with coach Rip Engle and observe the Penn State program.

"Joe was much further along at that time than I was," Bowden said. "I'm a couple years younger, but he was already in the big time and I was a small college."

"They had never heard of me," Bowden added. "But they were very nice and I remembered them. I know I remembered Joe as being a real sharp guy."

Penn State's nine-game winning streak is the longest in the country. Florida State, which had a 14-game win streak snapped earlier this year, has won its last five after successive losses at Miami and Auburn.

How can South make three no-trump against the lead of the heart king, the game is destined to fail. Here's how a Swedish champion made the game a couple of years ago.

In the everyday game, if West is good enough to start with the heart king, the game is destined to fail. East will signal with the seven and then overtake the third heart, giving the defense the first five tricks.

What did South do to prevent the run of the hearts? He gave East a problem and a choice of plays.

On the heart king South false-carded with his heart 10, and on the queen he dropped his heart jack. When East continued with the heart nine, East had something to think about.

What if West had started with the K-Q-8? If East overtook the nine, he would block the suit, and instead of five tricks, the defense would get only four.

Confidently East allowed West's nine to hold, and now the suit was really blocked. East's good hearts were worthless, and our cagey South escaped with 10 tricks.

When the defense is on its way to achieving its goal, it pays to throw blue smoke in hopes of confusing the issue.

Party pack urges safe holiday

BOISE — Holiday party hosts would be wise to remember that alcohol-involved accidents were responsible for 69 of the state's 238 traffic fatalities in 1989, according to the Idaho State Automobile Association.

To encourage party hosts to entertain responsibly, the motoring federation has assembled a complimentary "Holiday Party Pak," which includes recipes for non-alcoholic beverages, designated driver buttons, a blood-alcohol chart and the "Zero-Proof Pledge."

The "Holiday Party Pak" is available at the Twin Falls AAA office, 1041 Blue Lakes Blvd. N., or by writing to AAA Idaho, P.O. Box 15240, Boise, ID 83715.

"The Zero-Proof Pledge is a personal contract designed to encourage party guests and hosts to signal their intentions ahead of time," says Idaho AAA spokesman Dave Carlson. "By signing it, the individual agrees to one or more points, one of which includes the option to serve as a designated driver."

While last year's 238 traffic fatalities were the fewest in 10 years, approximately one-third of them involved alcohol. Not surprisingly, the incidence of alcohol-involved accidents is much higher between 8 p.m. and 3 a.m., when as many as one in 10 motorists may be driving legally impaired or drunk.

Unfortunately, year-end holiday parties increase the odds that drunk drivers will risk others with potentially deadly driving behavior.

Idaho's AAA annually hosts a campaign to alert partygoers about the options they have when attending holiday get-togethers.

"We recognize the important role a party host plays in assuring guests who don't drive after drinking," Carlson says. "When all the options are lined up in advance, tensions are lessened and a party can be more enjoyable."

The motoring federation offers these suggestions for responsible party planning:

• If you serve alcoholic drinks, make non-alcoholic beverages readily and abundantly available.

• Provide lapel buttons or stickers for designated drivers, those who agree to

In turn, the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities is putting together this exhibition as a means to

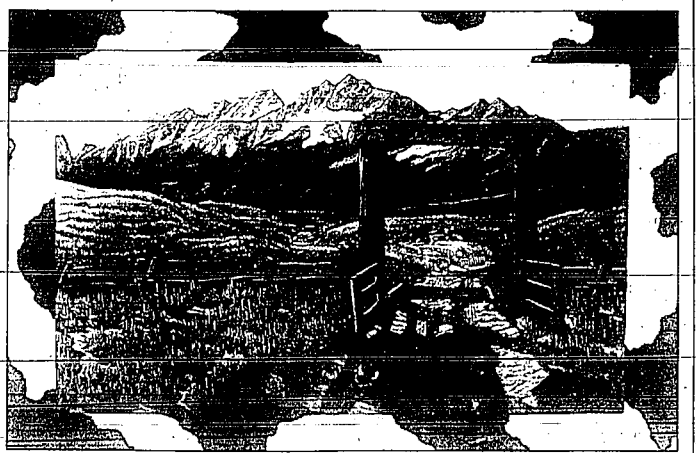

Kavesh Gallery show gathers 7 masters of glass

KETCHUM — Art glass has moved in many directions over the last three decades, starting from the traditions of the glassblower's pipe to forming glass by slumping, laminating, etching, cutting, etching and sandblasting the raw materials of sand and silica into the myriad forms, colors and textures we see today.

"Contemporary American Glass," an

exhibition on view today through Jan. 27 at the Kavesh Gallery, brings together seven major glass artists. They represent the broad geographic distribution of studio glass in America, as well as the range of techniques of creating art of glass that is available to the artist.

Artists included in the show are Douglas Anderson, Warsaw, Ohio, who will show pate-de-verre sculpture that is, sculpture formed from sintered

glass, placed in a mold then fused in high temperature kiln;

Dan Darley, Kensington, N.H., who will be represented by blown glass forms that are sandblasted and acid etched with his loose calligraphic drawings;

William Carlson, Urbana, Ill., who will show large scale sculpture which is fabricated from laminated, fused poly-

chromic glass which is set into granite. The various materials are then cut, preci-

sion ground and then optically polished.

Sidney Hatter, Jamaica Plain, Mass., who uses commercially produced plate glass which he transforms by laminating, cutting, grinding and sandblasting into transparent and translucent sculptural forms.

Jon Kuhn, Winston-Salem, N.C., whose sculpture combines lead crystal and colored glass powders which are cast

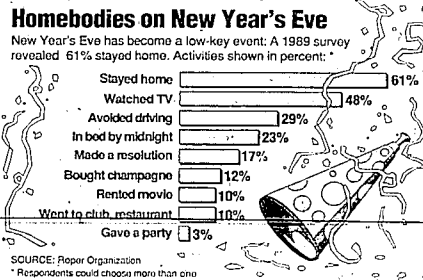

Critics ponder NBC's oversight

When NBC's "Today" did a segment on consumer boycotts recently — Marlboro and Miller Beer from Philip Morris, Spam and Dirty Moons stew from Hormel, tennis shoes by Nike, California grapes and canned tuna — was spread across the table in front of Deborah Norville.

Only one thing was missing: a light bulb from General Electric, target of one of the nation's biggest consumer boycotts — and owner of NBC.

GE's absence was no oversight. "The biggest boycott in the country is against General Electric," says Todd Putnam, editor of a newsletter called National Boycott News, a guest that morning on "Today," and a source of information for the producer of the segment.

But "Today" staffers who talked to Putnam while putting together the Nov. 26 segment had no interest when he suggested that they include GE.

Was it censorship, self-imposed, or otherwise? Or an honest difference of opinion on how to cover a story? NBC News says no corporate pressure was applied to "Today."

"The producer of the segment made an independent news judgment about what products to include," says Peggy Hubble, director of news information for NBC.

Hubble also says NBC News is sen-

sitive to the GE ownership issue. "If anything, we go to great lengths to ensure we neither bury negative stories about the company nor overplay the positive," she says.

But Jeff Cohen of Fairness and Accuracy in Reporting (FAIR), the left-wing media watchdog group, calls that the "bend-over-backwards defense" and says he just can't buy it.

FAIR has seized on the incident to argue that dangers arise when fewer and fewer huge corporations own the media. The result, says FAIR, is that "news coverage is already being bent."

"Perhaps so. Certainly the 'Today' show story suggests that, in this case, NBC News pulled its punches rather than get into a prickly situation involving GE."

According to Putnam, who keeps track of literally hundreds of boycotts for his newsletter, NBC contacted him in June because they were looking into boycotts. He told Amy Rosenberg, who works for "Today," about the GE boycott, which is led by a group called INFACT. INFACT called the boycott because, it says, GE plays a major role in the production of nuclear weapons.

As Putnam tells it, Rosenberg replied, "We can't do that one. Well, we could do that one, but we won't."

Some months later, Putnam talked

further with Roland Woerner, a producer for "Today" who joked that he'd be looking for a new job if he used the show to publicize a boycott of GE.

As it turned out, "Today" chose to focus on the better-known boycotts of Nike (criticized for not supporting black), Philip Morris (argued for backing Sen. Jesse Helms), Hormel (which is involved in a bitter labor dispute), California grapes (for labor and environmental reasons) and canned tuna (implicated in the deaths of dolphins).

It's worth noting, too, that NBC News has not run away from other GE-related stories. NBC has covered GE — when faulty GE engine parts were blamed for a plane crash last summer in Iowa City, Iowa; when a GE consultant lost his job for being critical of Congress; when GE was fined heavily for defrauding the federal government on a computer contract, and when GE was cited for faulty defibrillators affecting heart attack deaths.

That long list underscores the scope of NBC's GE problem. GE is such a giant company — No. 5 on the Fortune 500 — that potential conflicts arise all the time for NBC News. GE interests could come into play in stories about the Pentagon, the environment, nuclear power, the economy, trade policy, campaign finance and lobbying, not to mention toasters and refrigerators. Or light bulbs.

'Scissorhands' fairy-tale world is astonishing, but not moving

If you have scissors for hands, shoelaces are out. So is typing, the piano, and, presumably, foreplay. On the other hand, there's money to be made in topiary, hair and pet grooming.

It's exactly this kind of attention to practical detail, at the expense of larger issues, that gives Tim Burton's "Edward Scissorhands" its zeitgeist of craziness. Is it ever wacky, or what?

Burton wastes almost no time in the set-up, passing swiftly over the biology and origins of a young man with a maze of shears for digits, and gets swiftly and earnestly toward the practical aspects of the blade lifestyle.

In one sense, the movie sports what might be called a faux-naturalism that exalts the cliché and values the banality of expression and conventionality of emotion above all else. For example, nobody makes a big deal out of Edward's snippers; it's as if the people who see him are saying, "Hey, that guy has scissors for hands, doesn't he? Wow. Incidentally, who won the game last night?"

Yet at the same time, the movie is so far from formal naturalism as to be in a different solar system alto-

gether. It might be described as a fusion of fabulist styles: the gothic fairy tale and the drop-dead hip version of suburbia so beloved of modern filmmakers like David Lynch, David Byrne and Jonathan Demme. The trick of the flick is to take a character from the first — the frightening, frightened boy with garden shears at the end of his arms — and plunge him into the second, a generally bland, detailless suburb where the houses and the people are color-coded like Monopoly properties.

Edward is played by Johnny Depp, behind a Charles Addams complexion, heavy-metal wardrobe and hands by American Surgical Supply. He's living in an abandoned hilltop mansion out of Horror Inc. that perches above Your Suburb, U.S.A. An almost pathetic character, winsome and lyrical despite the weaponry, he instantly engages the sympathy of his discoverer, the Avon Lady, played with sweet earnestness and lack of condescension by Dianne Wiest, who is the best thing in this movie exactly as she's the best thing in every movie she's in.

Wiest quickly removes the blade boy to her home and inserts him, without much explanation, in the

family life. Both Dad and son Kevin (Alan Arkin and Robert Oliveri) accept without a hitch. When the family's teen daughter comes home from a camping trip, however, complications ensue.

Perhaps it wasn't such a good idea on Burton's part to have Winona Ryder play the sweet, nice, decent Kim Boggs. In Ryder's other movie of the season, "Mermaids," she provides a special poignant kookiness and comic timing; here, she's strictly from Dullesville, a conventionally imagined blond cheerleader.

Depp is very good, however. Using Dustin Hoffman's "Rain Man" shuffle and eyes blown out equally with horror and wonder, his chalk-faced Edward is like a mime with knives. And Burton gives him real personality, behind the magnificence of his warpage.

In the end, "Scissorhands" (rated PG-13) has more in common with one of the objects of its adoration than with other movies in the narrative tradition. It's less a story than a piece of topiary, in which a living thing — a story with a heart and real people as characters and a central stem of plot — has been snipped and tricked and decked out until it's quite astonishing, perhaps even memorable, but never moving.

Stars struggle to give credit where it's due

God is tops on the thank-you lists, followed closely by Mother.

Then let's mention 100 or so of your closest friends, family members and every single person who helped your career. Then, if you want to add another 100 or so names, why not thank every musical influence? And where would you be without all those people who ever bought your records or went to your concerts?

The treacly sentiment common on awards shows is even more common (and much more lengthy) on pop albums, where the demise of the large-format vinyl LP has given way to the multi-page compact-disc booklet, all the better to fill with thank-yous, thank-yous and more thank-yous.

In no other form of popular entertainment is gratitude so out of control. Not on TV, not in movies (unless someone dies on the set), not even in books, where the spouse is thanked for his or her understanding in one line of dedication and pretty much left at that.

Every day is Thanksgiving in the recording industry. Cassette-tape format cards, which usually end in the tone wallets, and thick CD booklets are jammed with hundreds of names of people to be thanked, lots of embarrassing personal messages, praise to God and to parents, and other fine-print dedications of influence.

If nothing else, the often-tell-a-lot about the performer, who obviously scrawls the lists personally (although bigger-name producers now get their own corner for giving thanks as well).

It's helpful to remember that not so long ago, when rock 'n' roll was young, it was not common to even credit musicians or backup singers on albums, let alone name every musical influence.

The Beatles managed to get through their career without thanking anyone in particular on their album sleeves (the ingrates!), not even the wives, mothers and dogs they sang about on vinyl. (Indeed, it's instructive to note that it wasn't until "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band" was issued in 1967 that lyrics were printed on a major pop record cover.)

As albums became a performer's means of personal expression in the late '60s and '70s, it was common to include not only credits for backup musicians but special thanks for a special someone or two who may have helped out during that particular period of life.

But the mania to print names on covers mushroomed fast enough that Todd Rundgren, for one, tried to put a step to all the nonsense nearly 20 years ago by inviting purchasers of one album to send in a card suggesting their names would be printed on the sleeve of the next album - and they were, albeit in eye-straining type.

The type is not much larger on today's packages, and the lists sometimes appear to be longer. Almost superstitiously, artists simply don't want to forget anyone who might have helped along the way. Especially family members, the producer and the deity.

God gets first dibs on thanks on most albums because, as the trio Guy explains on its group thank-you list (not to be confused with the individual, page-long thank-yous), "without Him, Guy wouldn't have existed, and we would not have anything."

And it's not nice to forget to thank your mother or the rest of your family or your girlfriends.

But even Living Colour, who thanks 141 people and organizations on its "Time's Up" album, apologizes: "There are too many great

The Beatles managed to get through their career without thanking anyone in particular on their album sleeves (the ingrates!), not even the wives, mothers and dogs they sang about on vinyl.

bands that we've worked with or heard to mention here." But since when is it a duty to list all the great bands you've heard?

For rappers, naming every single influence, every band you toured with or admired shows you are down with the posse. On "Fear of a Black Planet," Public Enemy thanks 347 people and organizations in 22 categories, from influences and inspirations to "sports brothers."

Sometimes special causes get a mention. Amid M.C. Hammer's thanks to 37 individuals and organizations on the 10-million-sold "Please Hammer Don't Hurt 'Em" album, he uses more words than he probably uses on the album. We join him already in progress: "...To all

black colleges trying to survive the economic crunch. Save our black colleges, save Southern University, the largest black college in the country ... M.C. Hammer will continue to support all who are trying to get an education, and I'm proud of you ..."

The more success, the more people to thank. That explains the immense list of thanks on the New Kids on the Block album, "Step by Step," on which Donnie Wahlberg whizzes by the other members by thanking 274 special people.

Thanks on country albums tend to be as comparatively short and sweet as a Grammy speech. But folk artists tend to be global in their approach.

On the first Indigo Girls album, Emily Saliers thanks (in addition to a dozen friends) "Joni Mitchell for the inspiration" and "the unsung heroes who spend their time helping those less fortunate." Her partner, Amy Ray, outdoes her to thank "every living creature in the universe." Well, why not?

Of course, it is the glimpse of personal lives that makes reading all this fine print interesting for the non-thanked.

At the end of a list of more than 75 people thanked in lowercase type on "Ghost of a Dog," the new Edie Brickell and New Bohemians album (among them, Bruce Hornsby and John Lydon), is "Paul."

But her reported naramour, Paul


Simon, is of the old school. He credits the musicians on his new "Rhythm of the Saints" album but leaves off any personal thanks, be it to Edie, Artie or anyone.

Sometimes perplexing things can be gleaned from the thanks. Neil Young made a big deal of being "sponsored by nobody" when he sang his anti-endorsement anthem "This Note's for You" a couple of years back. But on his recent "Ragged Glory," his thanks go to nearly 20 individuals and organizations, among them Ludwig drums and Zildjian cymbals.

Only rarely now are thanks sent sarcastically. But on Boogie Down Productions' "Edutainment," chief thanks go to George Bush for messing "up the nation and continuing the conspiracy to destroy the African!"

On its latest album, the metal band Anthrax notes: "As we were compiling this year's thank-you list, it dawned on us that we had more thank-yous than lyrics to our songs. Why have a list? You don't deserve to have to scan some list for hours, straining your eyes, looking for your name, only to find it spelled wrong."

In other words, it's tough enough being a head banger without having to worry about eye strain on top of it all. So Anthrax fans and supporters get the universal disclaimer: "You know who you are."

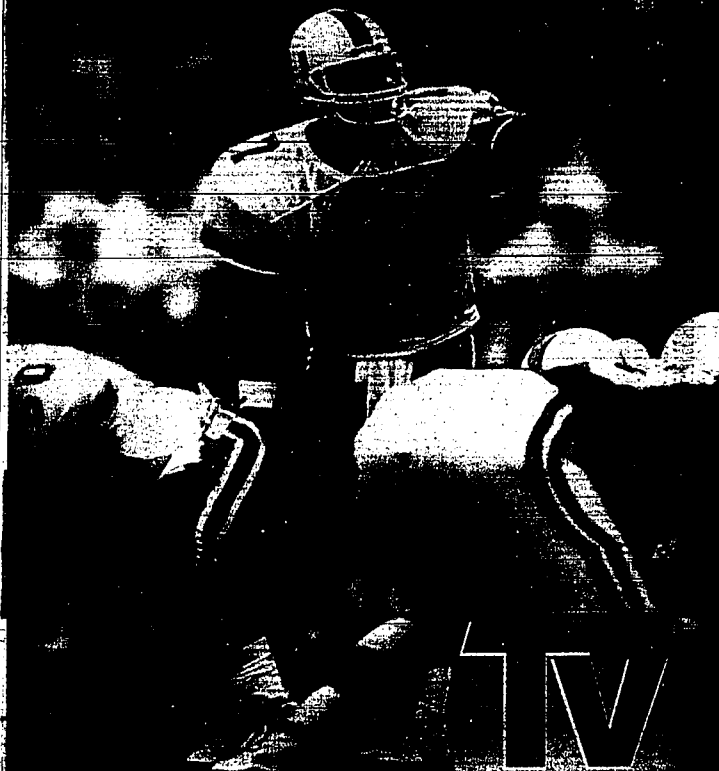

College football fans can grab seats: New Year's Day has 8 bowl games

We've never chosen sides in the debate over whether or not the NCAA should sponsor a national championship tournament for division I-A football programs — as it already does with divisions I-AA, II and III. But this year's muddled national-championship-picture and the likelihood that it's going to remain that way after Jan. 1 — has us leaping in favor of settling the thing once and for all each year with a tournament.

New Year's Day is a college-football fan's delight, featuring no fewer than eight bowl games. The most important contests of the day are the Citrus Bowl, where coach Bobby Ross leads undefeated Georgia Tech against Nebraska (airing on ABC); the Cotton Bowl, where Craig Erickson quarterbacks Miami against Texas (airing on CBS); and the Orange Bowl (airing on NBC), where a rested Rághib Ismail and Notre Dame take on Colorado, the current No. 1 team in the nation.

No single game will decide an undisputed national champion. That's not necessarily a bad thing, because it encourages spirited debate, which increases fans' interest. But the national championship carries many tangible rewards, not least of which are television exposure and increased attractiveness to prospective recruits. With such loot on the line, determining a legitimate No. 1 should be a priority. This year's bowl lineup falls short of the mark.

On New Year's Day, we ought to be tuning in to a national champi-

onship game between Georgia Tech (10-0-1) and Texas (10-1-0). If the bowl committees had observed the moratorium that once prohibited bids from being extended before Nov. 24, that matchup would have been possible. But since most bowl bids were openly decided a full week before that, it just won't be happening.

As things stand, Colorado's formula for claiming the national championship is simple: Beat Notre Dame. But even if the Buffaloes pull it off, their title will be tainted. Colorado's 10-1-1 record is clearly deserving of an asterisk, since they were the beneficiaries of an officiating blunder that allowed them to score the decisive touchdown against Missouri on fifth down as time ran out. A 9-2-1 record would place them solidly in the middle of a pack of at least a half dozen other

underachievers and out of the title picture.

The biggest loser in this year's mess is ACC champion Georgia Tech. The No. 2 Yellow Jackets are the only undefeated major college team in the nation, but they've ended up in a second-tier bowl against a Nebraska team ranked 13th in the UPI coaches poll and 19th in the AP media poll. If Tech beats the Cornhuskers, they still have to depend on Colorado losing to have a shot at the title.

Texas can also stake a claim as the nation's No. 1 team, but they'll need a little help. Obviously, No. 3 Texas has to beat Miami — no small order.

HBO's The Comedy Channel and MTV's HA! will become Comedy TV.

"Over time, the network will develop its own identity," said Frank J. Biondi, president and chief executive of Viacom International Inc., which owns HA! and the MTV Networks.

Biondi spoke at a news conference with Michael J. Fuchs, chairman and CEO of Home Box Office, the world's largest pay TV service.

Comedy TV will begin early next year, Biondi and Fuchs said, with HA! and The Comedy Channel continuing their separate operations in the interim.

No money changed hands in the

deal. The assets of each comedy channel will be transferred on Jan. 1 to the joint venture, based in New York City and staffed by employees from both HA! and The Comedy Channel. A president for the new channel will be chosen from outside Viacom and Time-Warner, which owns HBO. It has been tough sledding for both channels. HBO's channel was launched in November 1989 and MTV's HA! on April 1 this year. Both made original shows, but relied on reruns of off-network comedies to fill their 24-hour schedules.

The two channels reached a total of 15 million households, with HBO's channel in 8.5 million homes and MTV's in 6.5 million, but each rolled up big losses — as high as \$20 million a year. They also had trouble getting channel space on already packed cable systems. The CEOs said the merger made eco-

nomic sense.

"The bottom is that it would have been very expensive for us to push on," Biondi said. "Common sense prevailed. We were doing a very good job of standing each other up."

Rumors of the merger had been circulating for months. The deal was struck less than a month after two proposed rival cable services devoted to law — "In Court" and "American Courtroom Network" — said they would merge.

About 12 new cable services plan start-ups in coming months, according to one estimate by Erica Gruen, a cable analyst at Saatchi & Saatchi Advertising. The hopefuls range from a 24-hour talk show channel to the Cowboy Channel.

All-sports ESPN serves the most cable homes, 55.9 million, followed by Turner's Cable News Network, which serves 54.1 million.

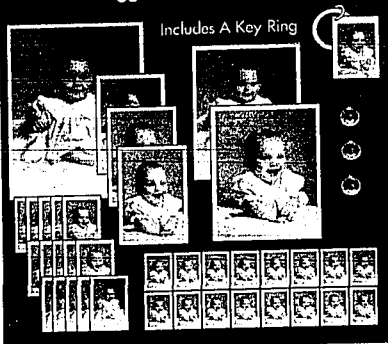
