Open bean records, judge orders state

TWIN FALLS — Fifth District Judge Daniel Hurlbutt has ordered that the Idaho Agriculture Department's secret bean-inspection records be opened, overturning a 25-year-old department regulation.

Hurlbutt ruled that the department has no right to keep secret the information it collects in the course of making certain that the state remains free of bacterial bean seed diseases.

"The position of the department was without reasonable basis in law or fact," Hurlbutt wrote as he ordered the depart-

ment to pay legal fees of Idaho Seed Bean Co.

The lawsuit is apparently the first test of Idaho's new open records law and Ron Bush of Boise, the attorney for a group of newspapers that lobbied for the law last year, lauded Hurlbutt's decision as upholding the intent of the Legislature.

"On the whole, the decision is consistent with the aims of the Legislature," he said. Steve Mendive, Idaho deputy attorney general for the agriculture department, declined to comment on the case.

Idaho Seed Bean Co. of Twin Falls sued the department to find out how many Idaho seed producers have illegally produced and sold one of its "protected" bean varieties

with the implied blessing of the Idaho Agriculture Department.

"My client feels that the state improperly authorized someone to sell their product without compensation," explained John Hohnhorst, the Twin Falls attorney for Idaho Seed Bean Co. Since April, 25,000 pounds of Midnight black turtle bean seed, a "protected" variety licensed to Idaho Seed Bean Co., have been destroyed in Twin Falls after they were sent back here from Michigan.

Those bean seeds, which originated in Idaho, were not sold by Idaho Seed Bean Co. and were not certified as Midnight seed by the Idaho Crop Improvement Association, as required by federal law for any

Midnight bean seed produced in Idaho.

Only plant patent owners may have their patented varieties certified.

But the seeds were "green-tagged" — an indication from the Idaho Agriculture Department that the seed was free of bacterial disease. Also attached was an "analysis" tag, providing information on the purity of the seed.

Both of those tags identified the seed as Midnight, according to a letter to the Idaho Agriculture Department from the New York Seed Improvement Cooperative, which also holds a license to produce Midnight seed.

Roger Vega, administrator of the Agri-

Bank panel leaders propose overhaul

WASHINGTON — The House Banking Committee's Democratic and Republican leaders offered separate proposals Thursday aimed at overhauling the nation's ailing financial system.

A bill sponsored by the committee chairman, Rep. Henry B. Gonzalez, D-Texas, would limit depositors to \$100,000 of federal insurance on their savings and checking accounts plus an equal amount in a retirement account. He also would create a single agency to regulate all banks, savings and loans, and credit unions.

Rep. Chalmers Wylie, R-Ohio, introduced legislation that would restrict deposit insurance and consolidate the bureaucracy but less dramatically than the Democrat's bill.

Meanwhile, the administration is putting the finishing touches on its own program, which President Bush is expected to outline in his State of the Union address on Jan. 29.

Gonzalez would restrict federal insurance regardless of the number of accounts an individual maintained or the number of institutions holding the accounts.

Wylie would restrict individuals to \$100,000 of insurance per institution, with an exception allowing an additional \$100,000 for retirement accounts. Depositors could obtain more insurance by going to other institutions, but regulators would get new power to restrict deposits placed by money brokers who divide the money of wealthy individuals and institutional investors among many institutions.

Other provisions in Gonzalez' proposal

would:

- Create a Federal Depository Institutions Regulatory Agency, which would take over the regulatory responsibilities of the Federal Reserve, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp., the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, which oversees nationally-chartered banks; the Office of Thrift Supervision; and the National Credit Union Administration. The FDIC would remain as a deposit insurer for all financial institutions. The Federal Reserve would retain its responsibilities over monetary policy.

- Charge banks in shaky condition more for deposit insurance than banks in sound condition.

- Charge banks an insurance premium for deposits held in overseas branches. Current provisions in Gonzalez' proposal

Tiny skulls open evolution gap

PITTSBURGH — Fossils of a goggle-eyed, mouse-size primate that ate fruit and swung from branches in North America 50 million years ago may provide clues about the speed of human evolution, scientists say.

The four Shoshonius fossils indicate the anthropoids — ancestors of the apes, monkeys and humans — diverged from some other primates at least 15 million years earlier than previously thought, researchers reported.

"The find kind of upsets the entire evolutionary tree," said Leonard Kratshalka, a paleontologist at Carnegie Museum.

The Shoshonius, similar to the modern tarsier, was named for Shoshoni, Wyo., the town in the Wind River Basin where the researchers found the skulls in rock quarried from 1984 to 1987. Leg, arm and jaw bones also were found.

"When we turned over that rock and saw those two eye sockets staring us in the face, we knew we had found something significant," said paleontologist Richard Stucky of Denver.

The anthropoids and the tarsier, a primate found in the jungles of the Philippines and Indonesia, are believed to have descended from a common, unknown ancestor, Kratshalka said.

Amateur sleuths believe cabinet from Earhart plane

WASHINGTON — Amateur aircraft sleuths speculated Thursday that a metal cabinet found on a remote South Pacific island is from the plane of aviator Amelia Earhart, who has been missing since 1937.

And while the investigators acknowledged that evidence linking the cabinet directly to the Earhart plane was circumstantial, an FBI expert said he found nothing "which would disqualify this artifact as having come from the Earhart aircraft."

Richard E. Gillespie, executive director of the International Group for Historic Aircraft Recovery, said at a news conference that the aluminum box found on Gardner Island had been identified as a navigator's bookcase of the type used during the era when Earhart's airplane disappeared.

"We've got the first artifact alleged to be from the Earhart aircraft that has passed muster of testing," Gillespie said, adding that members of his group

must return to the island to gather more evidence before the theory can be proved.

James E. Corby, chief of the materials analysis unit at the Federal Bureau of Investigation, analyzed the paint on the metal bookcase and said it was "consistent with the materials that were being used" in 1937.

Gillespie said the type of paint and the modifications of the box weren't consistent with military use, suggesting that it came from a civilian aircraft.

A floor plan of the Earhart aircraft indicates that the 14-by-9-by-9½-inch box could have fit exactly against a bulkhead under the navigator's table, he said.

Earhart was a pioneering aviator who in 1932 became the first woman to make a solo flight across the Atlantic. She and her navigator, Fred Noonan, disappeared July 2, 1937, while trying to complete an around-the-world flight in a two-engine Lockheed 10-E Electra.

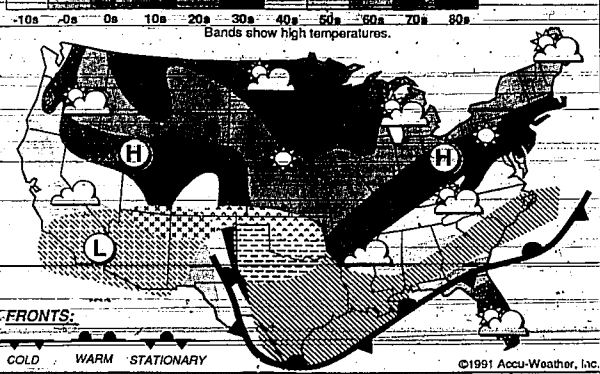

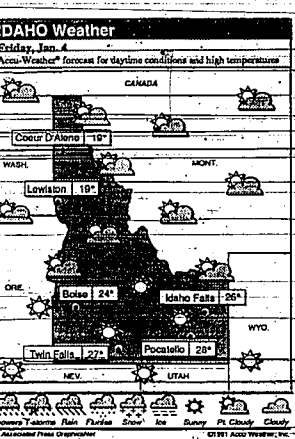

Evidence hints 3 Americans slain
 WASHINGTON - The State Department said Wednesday circumstantial evidence indicates that the three-man crew of a U.S. helicopter was shot to death by leftist rebels in El Salvador after the aircraft, struck by gunfire, had made a safe landing.

The P.O. U.S. Army's Richard Boucher stopped short of accusing the rebels of executing the three Americans. "It's still a final determination will be made after an investigation by a U.S. forensic team."

On Capitol Hill, Rep. Bud Shuster, R-Pa., a member of the House Intelligence Committee, said he had received "intelligence" that the helicopter had landed under control and the three American crewmen "were murdered with bullets to the backs of their heads."

Shuster said the craft was a clearly marked U.S. Army helicopter flying an administrative support mission for the U.S. Ambassador and the Americans aboard were in no way connected to the Salvadoran military.

The incident occurred in eastern El Salvador on Wednesday while the Americans were on a routine mission returning to Honduras after a visit to San Salvador.

Lujan, giant Japanese firm tangle
 WASHINGTON - Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan locked horns with one of Japan's biggest corporations Thursday, threatening to cancel its tourist concessions contract at Yosemite National Park. Company officials accused Lujan of Japanese bribery and trying to extort a \$100-million settlement. The osseous contract fell into the hands of the Japanese as part of the \$2 billion purchase of the entertainment giant MCA Inc. by Matsushita Electric Industries Co. last Saturday. An MCA subsidiary has held the concession rights at Yosemite for three decades.

Soviet council OKs economic plan
 MOSCOW - Mikhail Gorbachev moved to quash a new conflict with the Russian republic on Thursday when his strengthened Federation Council endorsed an economic plan for the 15 republics.

The first meeting of the revamped council also created a special working group, led by new Vice President Gennady Yanayev, to select members of Gorbachev's revamped Cabinet within two or three days.

The national legislature still must approve the Cabinet nominees, and the republic legislatures will have to accept the economic agreement, part of a larger Union Treaty intended to hold the fragmenting country together.

Somali rebels prepare final offensive
 NAIROBI, Kenya - Rebels in Somalia Thursday they had massed reinforcements in the embattled capital and were preparing a "final offensive" against President Mohamed Siad Barre.

Earlier in the day, the rebels of the United Somali Congress rejected Siad Barre's call for a cease-fire. They said they hoped to ally the United States and other Western nations for a quick evacuation of their citizens.

Siad Barre, accused by the rebels of running a "cruel, corrupt" government for the last 21 years, was believed to be in a fortified bunker at the seaside international airport south of Mogadishu.

Infant formula makers face lawsuit
 TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The Florida attorney general filed a civil lawsuit Thursday accusing three companies of conspiring to drive up prices on infant formula.

The lawsuit accuses Abbott Laboratories, American Home Products Corp. and Bristol-Myers Squibb Company of violating state and federal antitrust laws for an alleged series of "strike" price increases in 1979. Suits were filed for all three companies denied the accusations.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court, comes on the heels of this week's revelation that federal authorities are investigating infant formula prices, including those by the three companies.

 to come from the Gardner area, he said, adding that the island is on the navigation line that Earhart described in her radio signals.

A rescue plane circled Gardner on July 9, but found no trace of the Earhart plane. However, a crewman reported seeing signs of human habitation on Gardner Island.

The possibility that Earhart was on Gardner, Gillespie said, is further boosted by Coast Guardsmen operating a navigation station there in 1944 who reported finding a rain collection device that included a search of the island. That line, Gillespie said, would have brought Earhart to Gardner Island, then a deserted atoll called Nikumaroro.

Gillespie said his group, a nonprofit foundation known as the IGAR, searched uninhabited Gardner Island in 1989 and found 19 pieces of metal that could have come from aircraft.

Eighteen of the artifacts were useless, he said, but the aluminum box bore a serial number and was traced to the Generalized Aircraft Co. of San Diego, Calif., and showed the box was manufactured in the 1930s as a navigator's map case.

Gillespie said records show that Navy ships and shore radios received distress calls from Earhart for three days after the plane was reported missing. The signals seemed to come from the Gardner area, he said, adding that the island is on the navigation line that Earhart described in her radio signals.

Lawmakers say public not ready for war

WASHINGTON (AP) — Members of the new Congress say the people back home are vexed, frustrated and apprehensive about the prospect of going to war.

There's a general fear that the Vietnam syndrome is setting in — can't win, can't get out, said Rep. George Sangmeister, D-Ill., as hawks and doves alike reported Thursday they returned to the capital from a country perplexed.

The public is unwilling to tolerate Saddam Hussein's seizure of Kuwait, and doesn't want to undercut President Bush's diplomacy — but it is in no mood to go to war, and is full of questions, they said.

"They're all over the lot," said Rep. Dante Fascell, D-Fla., about his constituents. "They support the objective; they hope it will be done without war."

"They keep asking me, 'Will there be war?'" said Rep. Hamilton Fish, R-N.Y. "What's going to happen?"

But even Saddam Hussein could not spoil the backslapping, first-day-of-school atmosphere they prevail when a new Congress assembles, election victors all.

Still, this opening day was sobered by the knowledge that this Congress may be called upon to authorize — and finance — a war against Iraq that military leaders say could be brutal.

in the Senate, two liberal Democrats — Tom Harkin of Iowa and Brock Adams of Washington — tried to initiate a debate over whether a president can make war without Congress' formal approval.

The possibility of war is "being talked about in coffee shops, in the workplace, and in the homes," said Harkin. "Now is the time and here is the place to debate the constitutional prerogatives of the president of the United States."

But Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, eager not to undermine Bush's new diplomatic initiative, managed to cut off debate before it got started.

In the corridors of the House, members told reporters that apprehension over war dominated their meetings with constituents.

Rep. Bernard Sanders of Vermont, elected to the House as a socialist, said he conducted four town meetings and "had a very difficult time finding anyone who supports the president's position."

From the opposite end of the continent, Rep. Jim McDermott, D-Wash., said more than 1,000 Seattle people attended his community meetings during the holiday break and "I don't find anyone who wants to go in."

"Sunday morning, I go into a supermarket for my newspaper and I run into the mother whose son is

headed over there," Richard Durbin, D-Ill., told a reporter. "She was breaking down in tears right there in a grocery aisle. This is the toughest decision we can face as a public body."

Sangmeister said the Vietnam syndrome "kept arising." He said people dread a long, drawn-out, indecisive war. The question they ask, he said, is, "Can we do it in five days?"

It is customary for members of Congress to report that public sentiment mirrors their own.

Those who want a debate — or even a declaration of war before Bush orders an attack — said their constituents feel exactly that way.

"The people in my district can't understand what we're doing there," said a freshman from Detroit, Barbara-Rose Collins, D-Mich., "and neither can I."

But Rep. Arthur Ravenel Jr., R-S.C., who represents the old Navy port town of Charleston, said his voters think a congressional debate would be unproductive.

The country has used military force in more than 250 instances, he said, but declared war only four or five times. "People are overwhelmingly committed to seeing that Saddam Hussein doesn't get away with unchecked terrorism," said another freshman, Chet Edwards, D-Texas.

Pentagon will start giving vaccinations to soldiers

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vaccination of U.S. troops in the Persian Gulf as protection against germ warfare by Iraq will begin this week, the Pentagon said Thursday.

The Defense Department also announced that an additional 10,000 American troops had arrived in the gulf area, including elements of the famous "Big Red One" 1st Infantry Division from Fort Riley, Kan.

The U.S. force in the region now stands at 335,000. The Pentagon said 245,000 troops from allied nations are in the area.

The Iraqis, meanwhile, have added 20,000 troops to their force in Kuwait and southern Iraq, Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams said, bringing their total to 530,000. Most

of the extra forces have been deployed in southern Iraq, west of Kuwait, he said, extending the Iraqi line of defense against a U.S. flanking maneuver.

Williams said the Iraqis also have deployed 200 more armored personnel carriers and infantry fighting vehicles, for a total of 2,700, and an additional 300-artillery pieces, for a total of 3,000. He gave no comparable figures for U.S. forces.

"It's clear evidence that Iraq is making no move to withdraw its forces," he said.

Williams would not divulge details of the vaccination program, including how long it would take. But he said the first shots would be given "within the next day or so."

Cassia sheriff hopes arrest ends burglaries

BURLEY — A Wednesday arrest should put a stop to a string of burglaries plaguing rural Cassia County homes, Sheriff Bill Crystal said.

James T. Hutchison, 31, was arraigned Thursday and charged with four counts of burglary, Crystal said. He remained in the Cassia County jail Thursday night. Officers arrested Hutchison at his home east of Burley in the backseat of a Camaro County motor search wagon. Hutchison revealed several items reported stolen in recent local break-ins, Crystal said.

About \$13,900 worth of household appliances were reported stolen in November from four homes outside Burley and Duxie, he said. Some of those items, valued at \$5,000, were recovered from Hutchison's home, Crystal said.

In each burglary, the back door was kicked in to gain entry, he said, adding that Hutchison may be connected with two or three other burglaries.

Twin Falls woman to make restitution to ShopKo store

TWIN FALLS — A local woman faces three charges of grand theft and multiple petit theft counts after she admitted embezzling \$1,800 from the ShopKo store.

Kelly Edwards, 24, 1526 1/2 Filter Ave. East, has agreed to pay restitution to the store from her wages. She was working as the senior sales clerk in the store's home entertainment department at the time of the thefts.

The grand theft charges stem from three incidents in which Edwards allegedly voided customer receipts totaling \$507 and pocketed the cash, according to a police report.

On 27 other occasions, Edwards allegedly stole smaller amounts totaling \$4,292, according to the report, which said the thefts occurred between Aug. 30 and Nov. 23 of last year. Edwards also admitted stealing a cassette tape.

Store managers became aware of the scam when a customer returned an item, with the voided and initialed receipt to the store, the report said.

A public defender has been appointed to represent Edwards, who was released on her own recognizance after being arraigned Thursday.

Solid waste committee puts off meeting till Jan. 29

TWIN FALLS — The solid-waste committee of the South Central District Health Department has postponed its Jan. 9 meeting until the end of the month.

The meeting will be on Jan. 29.

The committee was scheduled to discuss regional landfill options for Magic Valley counties once the federal government implements new solid-waste disposal regulations. The eight counties are considering building two or three regional landfills to meet the new requirements, called Subtitle D.

The counties are expected to decide on a regional plan soon.

No one knows for sure when the federal Environmental Protection Agency will make Subtitle D public, but the new requirements are expected to make the cost of waste disposal more expensive.

State blames wood stoves for causing air stagnation

TWIN FALLS — An air stagnation advisory issued Wednesday by the state Air Quality Bureau continued in effect Thursday but it does not include the Magic Valley.

It was issued for the Southwestern corner of the state from Elmore County to the Oregon border, and a 25-mile-diameter area around Pocatello.

The advisory bans outdoor open burning and asks residents to use wood stoves unless they are the primary heat source.

ATV fans must now register vehicles as motorcycles

BOISE — All-terrain vehicles that are driven on public highways must be registered as motorcycles under the new law that takes effect Thursday.

In the past, wheel-drive ATVs operated on public highways were registered with passenger car license plates, while 3-wheel ATVs were registered using motorcycle plates. Legislation last year changed this to require motorcycle plates for both 4-wheel and 3-wheel ATVs.

The motorcycle-ATV plate program is an annual one, so credit cannot be given on an ATV's present passenger plates. ATV users can operate on a passenger plate until it expires.

Fees for motorcycle registration will increase for \$6 to \$9, and a \$6 off-road sticker will be required if the ATV will be used off the highway.

He held a news conference reflecting on his eight years as attorney general, Jones' leaves office Monday as Democrat Larry

Chilly yes, but record not broken

BOISE — Six days of record-breaking cold temperatures on and before Christmas created new seasonal demand for electricity by Idaho Power Co. customers, but the company said no records were broken.

"We experienced extremely high loads," Steve Watanabe, the Boise-based utility's power scheduling supervisor, said in a news release. "But we didn't set any new peak records."

The daily peak demand figure from Dec. 20 through Dec. 25 averaged 2,073 megawatts in the company's southern Idaho, northern Nevada and eastern Oregon service area. Watanabe said the highest peak load was 2,165 megawatts at 10 a.m. on Christmas Eve.

Idaho Power's all-time record peak demand of 2,327 megawatts came on Feb. 7, 1989.

Although the recent cold snap's temperatures were more severe than those of 22 months ago, the likely difference in demand was due to timing, Watanabe said. The company sees a decline in commercial and industrial demand for electricity during holiday periods.

The Bonneville Power Administration, however, set a new peak load record of 3,903 megawatts on Dec. 21. The cold snap stretched the Portland, Ore.-based system's supplies, but caused no major outages.

The BPA called up all its reserves including combustion turbines and other rarely used generators to meet the heavy demand. It also canceled its sales to California.

Bliss mayor shocks council with resignation

BLISS — Bliss Mayor Roland Zollinger, who has served in office twice, sometimes been marked by controversy, has resigned.

"I think that 16 years, (as mayor and councilman) is a long time," Zollinger told a stunned City Council Wednesday night.

Zollinger was one of the longest-serving mayors in Idaho.

"I'm not really thankful to the people of Bliss and the surrounding area, but I have a business to take care of. I just don't feel I can handle the business and the city," he said.

"I don't have time to run out to that pipe every five minutes," Zollinger said, referring to the problem the city has been having with the city plumbing system since late

November. "I just feel it's time. I think it's time to quit."

"I've had good council members. I'm really grateful," Zollinger said during his resignation announcement.

City Council President Sam Bishop, a 62-year-old Bliss native, will take over as mayor of the 200-member community.

Bliss voters have re-elected Zollinger four times since 1977.

Two years ago, the mayor was embroiled in a dispute after several Bliss residents complained about firewood on Zollinger's business storage yard.

Zollinger moved the lumber and, then in turn complained about the neighbors' yards.

Deadlines passed and the dispute died. But the issue resurfaced recently when Zollinger complained about trash on the

town's main street. Residents circulated a petition that protested the appearance of the mayor's business and residence at the north end of Bliss.

During Zollinger's tenure, several new businesses such as Nevada Cement, Evans Seed and Brosse Chemical moved into town.

Zollinger said during his resignation announcement that he hoped Bliss' businesses would stop fighting amongst themselves, and help to bring new business into town.

"I wish that businesses could get along and help one another and keep this city growing," Zollinger said. "I think we have a beautiful town here, and I'd like to see it grow."

Zollinger talked about gasoline prices and trucking and said gas in Bliss costs 10

cents more per gallon than in several surrounding counties. And he said he has spoken to truckers who are unhappy with the price of gas in Bliss.

Bliss relies heavily on revenue from trucks traveling Interstate 84. The town has three truck stops.

Zollinger said he would spend more time on his business and with his family, and said he is confident in Bishop's ability to take over the running of the town.

Bishop, who has served 12 years on the council, said he feels well acquainted with the ins and outs of the mayor's job. He told the council, however, that he has some reservations about taking over the position vacated by Zollinger.

"I think you've done a good job," Bishop told Zollinger. "I hate to see you go. I'm

2 car dealers put brakes on their bids

JEROME — Two local car dealers have refused to submit new "proposals" for a new pickup truck for the city for the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

At a previous meeting, the City Council unanimously accepted a \$6,877.29 bid for the pickup, as submitted by Go-Paulco Chevrolet of Jerome and rejected a lower bid of \$6,749 from Roy-Raymond Ford of Twin Falls.

Costs for shutting the vehicle back and forth to Twin Falls for repairs was cited as justification for awarding the purchase to a

Jerome business.

Accepting the higher bid was contingent upon approval from the city's attorney, Robert Williams III. He advised the council that accepting the higher bid was illegal, so the council rejected all bids at last month's council meeting and asked for "proposals" instead.

Both dealers, Con Paulos and Roy Raymond, told the council they would not submit a new "proposal," which is different from a bid.

"The Ford dealer advised us not to send him bids in the future," Mayor Gerald Ostler told the council at Wednesday's meeting.

"We're mulling up the balance of the bid process. Because the bid process benefits the city and bidders, it's to our advantage to use the bid process," Ostler said.

Councilman Don Jacobson advised the council that under state law the city is not required to put equipment costing less than \$10,000 into bid.

Councilman Edza Hill told the council he still thinks it is best to well acquainted with a Jerome dealer, "but under the circumstances, I'll go along with the low bidder," he said.

The council then unanimously approved a motion made by Councilman Rocky

Craig takes oath, LaRocco joins delegation

WASHINGTON — New Sen. Larry Craig of Idaho says it will be a challenge to move up from the House to the U.S. Senate.

Craig, a Republican, was sworn in to succeed McClure and Rep. Larry LaRocco. LaRocco started a two-year term succeeding Craig as Idaho's 1st District congressman.

Rep. Richard Stallings, D-Idaho, began his fourth term in the 2nd District. Meanwhile, Republican Sen. Steve Symms became the state's senior senator, which means he will be able to make recommendations on filling certain federal jobs.

DUI may not hold up in court

BOISE (AP) — Motorists charged with drunken driving have the right to offer evidence challenging the results of tests to determine their alcohol content, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

The three-judge panel voted unanimously Thursday to vacate and return to 2nd District Court the case of Bennie Jo Pressnall of Moscow, who was convicted of drunken driving after being arrested Feb. 27, 1982.

Pressnall underwent a series of field sobriety tests and later submitted to two breathalyzer tests on an Intoximeter 3000 at the Latah County Jail.

The results showed breath-alcohol levels of 0.15 and 0.17 percent, well above the legal limit of 0.10.

At his trial, the defense called an

expert witness who said a man of Pressnall's height and weight who drank seven-beers-and-two-shots might have had an impact on the jury's decision.

"Assuming the jury believed Pressnall's testimony regarding his alcohol consumption, the excluded testimony would have demonstrated that Pressnall's alcohol concentration was lower than that shown by the 'intoximeter,' and consequently would have permitted the jury to doubt the accuracy of the state's evidence," Chief Judge Jesse Walters wrote.

The appellate court also said it was not clear, as the state contended, that the jury would have found Pressnall guilty anyway under the theory that he was "under the influence" of alcohol based on the field sobriety tests and police testimony about his behavior and appearance when arrested.

But 2nd District Judge John Bengtson ruled that evidence about blood-alcohol content was irrelevant, and a jury found Pressnall guilty.

Quakes rattle Carson City, but cold causes worse damage

CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) — A check Thursday by geologists showed most of the cracks, including an airport runway crack, attributed to a swarm of 51 earthquakes apparently occurred before the quakes.

No injuries were caused by the quakes that rattled Nevada's capital city over a 14-hour period Wednesday, including one registering 4.6 on the Richter scale that was felt some 20 miles away in Reno and Lake Tahoe.

"We didn't find any cracks that we could clearly relate to fault activity," said John Bell of the Nevada Bureau of Mines and Geology. "The crack at the airport had been there for quite awhile. It had cobwebs, snow and other junk in it."

Bell said extremely cold weather in recent weeks probably caused much of the asphalt cracking. But he said shaking caused by the quakes Wednesday did damage a parking lot at the Western Nevada Community College here.

Bell also said he walked along all three major faults here and saw absolutely no evidence of any cracking along them at all.

He said the quakes were not deep-below-ground, which accounted for their sharpness, but were not of enough magnitude to cause surface ground breaks.

Seismologists also determined the faults causing the activity were the north-south Genoa and Pinnet Mountain faults, which run on either side of Carson City and intersect near the quake epicenter three miles north of town, he said.

The strongest tremor shook the Nevada Capitol and other large state buildings. Minor structural damage included a small crack in a wall in the annex behind the Capitol. Ceiling tiles and bits of plaster fell in other state buildings.

People also reported items falling off walls. About 1,000 in damage was caused at a local supermarket when glass bottles and jars were thrown from shelves. Phone service was disrupted briefly in some areas.

The quakes started just after 4 a.m. Wednesday with a 3.1 jolt and continued until just after 6 p.m. The last two significant quakes were 3.9 and 2.4 on the Richter scale.

going to file against a skateboard. He said the bicycle could be sold or used by local police agencies. Police in Sun Valley and Ketchum patrol on bikes.

Blaine County's actions are not out of the kind in Idaho. Last year, a mountain bike being used to extend a marijuana-growing operation in northern Idaho was seized and forfeited, an Idaho Department of Law Enforcement spokesman said.

home. Some were stopped driving away from the home, allegedly possessing quantities of cocaine ranging from one-half to five grams.

Ketchum attorney H. Craig Haukauskas is representing Pressnall and another of the vehicle owners, according to the prosecutor's office, singling out the defendants for extraordinary punishment because the arrests have captured public attention in the Wood River Valley.

"My guess is they're trying to make an example of these people because a number of arrests were made, not just one," Haukauskas said. There have been a number of past cases where people were stopped

for driving under the influence paid charged with possession of marijuana or cocaine, and the vehicles were not confiscated.

"I always look at forfeiture in any criminal case," Williamson responded. "We should focus on supply and demand at this level, not all civil and criminal penalties."

The forfeiture actions were filed by the state Department of Law Enforcement in 5th District Court in Hailey at the request of Williamson's office.

Law Enforcement Director Richard Cade has recommended that the vehicles be turned over to the county's drug task force.

Thursday was the first day of the 102nd Congress, and Craig was sworn into office by Quayle shortly after noon. He was honored later at a reception in the U.S. Capitol and then met with Sen. Robert Dole, R-Kan., Senate GOP leader.

Craig's first day as a senator also included a briefing by Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and Secretary of State James Baker on new developments in Iraq.

Craig, best Democrat Ron Twigg, got to fill the seat vacated when McClure retired after 18 years in the Senate and 24 years in Congress. Craig served 10 years in the House.

Under the watchful eyes of family and friends, LaRocco joined 42 other neophyte lawmakers in taking the pledge.

The House chamber was packed with the children and grandchildren of lawmakers. Some sat directly in front of LaRocco, while others barreled up and down the aisles or bounced on the plush leather seats.

"This is a great day," exclaimed LaRocco, a 44-year-old Democrat from Boise who defeated Republican John Snyms for the right to succeed Craig in the 1st Congressional District seat. "It's exhilarating and also very humbling to be serving in this great body."

"Next to my marriage and the birth of my children this is the best day of my life," said LaRocco, who was standing by his father as well-wishers steamed into his new office.

"This is pretty exciting," the 20-year-old political science student said. "This is his third time and

there has been a lot of stress on the family."

Chris LaRocco, the lawmaker's wife, recently won a national teaching award for her work at Boise High School where she taught English.

Although she is looking forward to her new life in Washington, she admitted leaving Idaho will be "bittersweet."

"It will be painful to leave teaching in Idaho," she said.

LaRocco, who once worked for former Senator Frank Church, said his former mentor taught him to always "do right" and risk the consequences.

"He also taught me the importance of answering each constituent letter of phone call no matter what party there are," he said.

not sure I'm thrilled about being mayor."

"I'm not really enthusiastic about accepting the responsibility," Bishop said later. "But somebody has to. I sure have to see him go."

we would be over more subject than we are now to having our water plundered."

Jones also said he felt the state has made great progress in the last

eight years in improving the rights of the victims of crimes.

"Eight years ago, victims were a forgotten entity in the criminal process," he said. "We have put victims in different light in the process through victims rights programs, he said."

He said he felt Echohawk would deal fairly with his staff, despite the fact he's from a different political party.

"I have to say I like what I have seen so far. Things are moving in the right direction," he said.

feel the recession



BOISE (AP) — Cautious optimism is being expressed Thursday as small business and mining officials warned legislative revenue estimators not to expect much from their sectors in the coming year.

"Small business confidence is in free fall" nationally, Pete Skamsner, Idaho director of the National Federation of Independent Business, said. "And there's a lot of pessimism here in Idaho."

Jack Lyman, executive director of the Idaho Mining Association, said the national recession that President Bush has finally acknowledged threatens his industry, already depressed by low market prices.

"The demand for Idaho minerals is closely tied to the national economy and the current national recession could alter current expansion plans and delay new project start-ups," Lyman said, adding, "If low prices persist, continued operations could be threatened."

Lyman told the House-Senate Committee on Revenue Projection that it should look to his industry for no more state tax revenue than it generated in the past year and possibly less.

"I would be extremely conservative," he said, and Skamsner maintained that while current state economic activity does not seem to justify the gloomy outlook among small businessmen, they are nervous about the future because of the Persian Gulf crisis, taxes they fear Congress will continue to raise as federal red ink increases and regulatory actions that add to their operating costs.

"All of this seems to be a bleak outlook in the short term — six to nine months," he said.

The relatively dark picture both invited revenue to counter the restrained optimism of other business and financial leaders appearing before the panel as well as the views of Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus.

The 16-member committee, in its second day of hearings on Idaho's financial future, is charged with determining exactly how much revenue the state's tax structure can be expected to generate.

Its estimate will guide lawmakers in formulating a new state budget over the next three months.

Developer sues city over housing tract

BOISE (AP) — A Boise developer is seeking \$3-million in damages from the city of Boise, maintaining that costly conditions placed on the planned Foothills housing tract are illegal.

Stephen Hosse, president of The Hosse Co., Inc., contends the City Council broke the law in bowing to neighborhood pressure against the Highland Nines project.

The developer was required in October to build sidewalks a mile from the property and contribute financially to a secondary access road.

City officials say they acted responsibly and legally in placing additional conditions on the controversial 64-home project's use permit.

But the Highlands Nines suit and a similar legal challenge filed recently by developers of 177-home Castle Rock, another hotly opposed Foothills project, pack the power to determine urban land-use planning for years to come.

Education officials to meet with school board over bus fleet

CRAIGMONT (AP) — An Idaho Department of Education official will meet with the Highland School Board about bringing the district's bus fleet into compliance with state regulations.

Superintendent James McPherson said an audit by the department revealed the fleet, owned and operated by Osburn Brothers of Craigmont, was in violation of 15 different "requirements." McPherson termed the violations as "relatively minor and some that weren't so minor."

The violations included drivers failing to conduct pretrip inspections before each route, drivers not using the proper operating procedures for each type of vehicle, no load or unload passenger, no training program for drivers, no 60-day bus inspection and students entering and leaving the buses improperly.

Governor appoints Meridian woman to PUC

BOISE (AP) — Gov. Cecil Andrus has named Marsha Smith of Meridian to succeed Peter Swisher on the Idaho Public Utilities Commission, marking the first appointment of a woman to the three-member regulatory panel.

Smith, 40, has been an attorney for the PUC since 1980 and most recently has been director of policy

and external relations. She replaces Swisher, who is retiring Jan. 14 after 10 years as general counsel of the commission.

"I have the welcome pleasure of not only naming the best-qualified person I could find, but also correcting the long-standing absence of a woman in this tremendously important job," Andrus said Thursday at a news conference.

Smith's appointment to the \$25,000-a-year job follows two other high-level state positions Andrus has given to women recently: Betty Richardson of Boise, who was named to the Idaho Industrial Commission last month, and Cathy Silk of Boise, filled a vacancy on the state Court of Appeals earlier last year.

Both are the first women in their respective positions. Also Thursday, Andrus named Marc Johnson, 37, his press secretary over the past four years, to succeed former state senator Mike Mitchell as the governor's chief of staff. And Scott Peyron, 37, former sports reporter and columnist, for

the Idaho State Board of Education. Idaho State Board of Education trustees managed to elect a Democrat to succeed Johnson as secretary. At the PUC, Smith will be one of the nation's leading public utility communication regulators.

Chiefs' DeBerg in rare post-season play

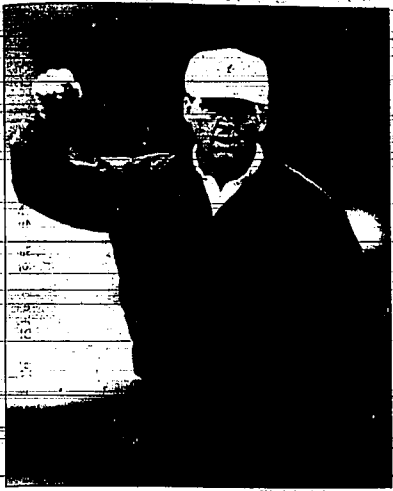

Steve DeBerg is an old quarterback with a relatively new feeling. "I'm not a big expert on this by any means," DeBerg said in anticipation of Kansas City's AFC first-round playoff game at Miami on Saturday. DeBerg, who will be 37 in two weeks, has been in the playoffs only once before in his career. He was Denver's quarterback in 1983, when the Broncos lost to Seattle in a first-round game. "Experience is very valuable for a quarterback," DeBerg said. "If you take care of your body and don't let yourself slide physically, as you go along, your bag of tricks gets bigger and bigger. You use all the little things that you gather during your career to help you perform at a higher level. That's what all players try to do

during the playoffs, which open Saturday with the Kansas City-Miami game and Washington at Philadelphia. On Sunday, Houston is at Cincinnati, New Orleans at Chicago. DeBerg started the season 30-70 as a starter. He became the first Kansas City quarterback to start every game since 1983 and led the Chiefs to an 11-5 record. "I'm playing better than I ever have," DeBerg said. "I have a great understanding of the game, and I don't get fooled by anything anymore. So I'm playing very relaxed, and I am throwing the ball as accurately as I ever have." Under DeBerg, Kansas City won six of its last seven games. He led the Chiefs to a 21-10 victory over Chicago last weekend despite playing with a cracked, little finger on his left (non-throwing) hand. DeBerg completed 25 of 32 passes for 276 yards. Saturday's other game will feature

two quarterbacks seeking their first playoff victory: Randall Cunningham of Philadelphia and Mark Rypien of Washington. "We know we've lost in the playoffs twice, so we're not going to settle for anything less than a win," said Cunningham, who threw for a career-high 30 touchdowns this season. Losses to Chicago in 1988 and to the Los Angeles Rams in 1989 have kept Cunningham from showing he can lead the Eagles to victory in the playoffs. Eagles coach Buddy Ryan said Cunningham hasn't played well in playoff games. "In Chicago, we threw for 400 yards, but we turned the ball over six times in the 'Rog-Bowl,'" Ryan said. "And then last year, it was a terrible game. He had nobody to help him, but he didn't play that well either."

Rypien, 5-2 since returning from arthroscopic knee surgery, will be making his first playoff start. "This means a lot for all of us, not just me," Rypien said. "For me, it's a chance to get going and showing what I can do." Washington will be starting a different quarterback for the fifth time in the last five games against the Eagles. "It's still out there for him as to how good he's going to be," Redskins coach Joe Gibbs said of Rypien. "He has shown he can beat good football teams." Houston also will start Cody Carlson against the Bengals. In his first start of the season, Carlson replaced injured Warren Moon and led Houston to a 34-14 victory over Pittsburgh Sunday, putting the Oilers into the playoffs for the fourth consecutive season. "I wish I could play a game like that and have no attention," Carlson said. "That makes it easier, but that's not the way it works."

Wadkins weathers rain for early lead

CARLSBAD, Calif. (AP) — Lanny Wadkins, adjusting to a chilly rain, opened up a 3-stroke lead Thursday in the first round of the Tournament of Champions, the kickoff event on the PGA Tour. "You have to try to slow down in these kind of conditions," said Wadkins, one of the fastest players in professional golf. "You need patience. And I'm not the most patient guy in the world." Wadkins bided his time and made the most of his back-nine opportunities in compiling a 7-under-par 65 in the first competitive round of the 1991 season. "I'm totally surprised," said Wadkins, who was this year's winners-only event in 1982 and 1983. "I didn't know what to expect. I didn't do a lot of practice at home in Dallas. The weather wasn't too swift. So I didn't know what to expect." "I still don't. It was later in the year, I'd already be thinking about winning. But now I'm just thinking about working on my swing." That swing put the ball in all but one of the fairways at La Costa and left Wadkins well in front of Tom Kite and Chip Beck, who tied for second at 68. PGA champion Wayne Grady was next at 69. Greg Norman, the Australian who led the American tour in earnings and stroke average last year, led a second group at 70 that also included David Hoad, Fred Couple, John Huston and Wayne Levi, whose four tournament victories was the most on the tour last year.

U.S. Open champ Hale Irwin matched par 72 and Paul Azinger, the defending titleholder, took a 74. Frank Beard had to struggle back from a triple bogey to produce a 69 that led the 13 seniors, playing in a separate but simultaneous competition. Beard pulled a 6-iron into a bunker on the par-3 third hole and took three to get it out, put his next in the fringe and eventually one-putted for a 6. "I just kind of blanked out," he said. "Instead of taking my beating, I kept trying to hole it or something. But that's what old men do." He was one in front of Bruce Crampton, who missed a 6-foot birdie putt on the first two holes, but ran in a 40-footer on the fourth, got a wedge shot close on the ninth and turned in 2-under-par. A 25-foot putt on the 11th started a string of three consecutive birdies and he needed only a 30-inch putt after a wedge shot on the 15th. That put him six under par for the day, but he bogeyed the 16th from a bunker and, at that point, was in a three-way tie for the lead. He pulled away, however, with 15-foot putts on the last two holes, while Kite and Beck played them one over.

Chicago to rely on Dan Hampton factor

LAKE FOREST, Ill. (AP) — The Dan Hampton factor will be in full force for the Chicago Bears on Sunday when they meet the New Orleans Saints in a playoff game. This is the final season for the 12-year defensive tackle who has survived many injuries, but he hopes it isn't the final game. "I don't know what it's all about," Hampton said of the Hampton factor. "It seems like the guys feel good when I dress and play with them." Hampton, 33, has suffered 19 injuries in his career, begun when the

Bears made him a first-round choice out of Arkansas in 1979. He has had knee surgery 10 times. In games he has played, the Bears have a 79-24 record. In games he has missed, the Bears are 8-16. His influence was most evident last season, when the Bears started 4-0 but went 2-10 as Hampton missed the final 12 games because of a knee injury. "Fortunately, good things happen when I play," said Hampton, who is retiring at the end of the season. "Let's hope it continues for a while."

Linebacker Mike Singletary, with Hampton through the Bears' lean times and good, said, "Dan means a great deal in this team as a motivator and as a guy who has been in the trenches for a number of years. Women's roundball back on TV after long hiatus

NEW YORK (AP) — The site was Catic Field House at the University of Maryland. Stanley were there with the powerful Immaculata team to face the Lady Terrapins. It was Jan. 26, 1975, and NBC made the first women's game on network TV. Women's college basketball gets its second chance on Saturday, 15 years later. CBS Sports will televise a Big Ten-Southeastern Conference doubleheader at Carver Hawkeye Arena in Iowa City from 1:30-6 p.m. EST. The first game has No. 3 Purdue against No. 7 Auburn, and the second game matches No. 9 Georgia against No. 15 Iowa. CBS's telecast marks the first time on a network for an NCAA regular season women's game. The Maryland-Immaculata game fell under the auspices of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. "I saw the whole thing. It was such a rabid fan," said Mimi Griffin, a former player and coach who will be CBS's analyst for the games. "I was playing for Pitt at the time, a freshman." "We all, I mean the women's basketball community in general, thought this was incredible. At that time, women's basketball had a great resurgence." Griffin remembers a couple of women's games during the late-70s that drew 7,000 to Anderson Square Garden, and another men's women's doubleheader with a big crowd. "I think the women's game was Immaculata and Queens. More than half the people in the Garden left after the women's game," she said.

But that was a long time ago. People got tired of watching a walk-up-the-floor, pound-it-inside type of game, Griffin said. They wanted speed, creativity, 3-point shots and fast breaks. And then the personalities — Nancy Lieberman, Carol Blazewski, Ann Meyers. "We need more of those people in the game," said Griffin, who began her broadcast career in 1983 with ESPN. She singled out Cheryl Miller, the former Southern California star, as the type of woman needed to keep the game in the spotlight. "Cheryl was tremendous for the game, not just for her physical abilities, but for her flamboyance," Griffin said. "She was in a media market that loved her style. The purists might not have liked her style, but she was great for the game." "We've got some great teams, but we don't have players like that right now. We might have to select good players and teach them how to market themselves on the exposure and media, and how to best present themselves and the game." Women's basketball is back on network because of CBS Sports' deal with the NCAA for its men's basketball tournament. The women's tournament was part of the \$1 billion package.

Griffin said she was disappointed from about 1979 and really through the '80s, and then, fortunately, the foresight of the people at the NCAA to include women's basketball as part of the package was a step in the right direction, Griffin said.

Twin Falls doctor shortage has no quick and easy fix

Whether Twin Falls physician shortage is a problem or a crisis depends on whether you have run into it personally.

"Hello," you say to the doctor's office receptionist. "I'd like to make an appointment with Dr. Sandwedge."

"Have you been in previously?"

"No," you say. "We just moved to town a few months ago, and—"

"I'm sorry," the receptionist says. "We can't accept any new patients."

"But I'm sick, and this is the fifth doctor I've tried to make an appointment with. And we have insurance."

The receptionist is sympathetic but firm. No new patients.

Carry on that conversation a few times, and you no longer have any doubt. A crisis? You bet.

The problem has more than one cause. So don't expect a quick and easy solution. It also isn't strictly local. Idaho's doctor-patient ratio reportedly is the nation's lowest.

But Twin Falls, increasingly a regional center for retail and professional services, is especially susceptible to shortages in key service occupations.

Briefly, here are the problems, and what might be done.

• Idaho has no medical school to produce home-grown doctors.

Although the state can't start a medical school in the foreseeable future, it can take some steps. State Sen. Russ Newcomb, a Twin Falls surgeon, suggests expanding the number of slots reserved for Idaho students at the University of Washington's med school.

The Legislature also will look this year at helping new doctors pay off their education loans, as an incentive for hanging their shingles in Idaho.

Taxpayers, however, may balk at handing money to people who soon will drive Mercedes-Benzes.

Solutions that don't involve tax-supported handouts should be looked at first. Still, if bribery (there's no other name for it) is the only way to overcome the state's handicap in the medical marketplace, we may have to look in that direction.

Newcomb makes another good point

on this subject: If such a program begins, don't restrict it to native Idahoans. If a doctor is willing to come here to practice, why should we care where he or she grew up or went to school?

Medical care is one of several fields in which services have lagged behind Twin Falls' growing needs. To make matters worse, several busy doctors have retired or left town in recent years.

Local hospitals already are busily recruiting new physicians. Beyond lending moral support, the community probably can't do much to help. But read the next item.

Physicians and their spouses are highly educated and command high incomes. Accordingly, they want rich cultural and social opportunities, and they often are skeptical about finding happiness in a small town.

This is a tough one. But it suggests one way the community might help recruit doctors. Hospitals might be able to entice arts groups, real-estate professionals, civic leaders and outdoor-sports enthusiasts in persuading prospects that this is dandy place to live. There's more to life than opera.

Federal Medicare reimbursement rules favor urban doctors. This is a long-time beef of small-town hospitals and doctors, and it's a valid one. For performing the same procedure, a small-town doc receives considerably less federal reimbursement than a city colleague would get for the same job.

The reasons for this inequity are hard to grasp, but the result is plain: an incentive for doctors to shun rural and small-town practices. Even dedicated healers go where the money is.

Congressmen from rural states should keep plugging to level the playing field.

Even if every tactic on this list were employed, the shortage won't end soon. People who don't have family doctors will continue having trouble finding one.

For those people, the only short-term recourse may be to try to stay healthy.



Iraqi nuclear capacity a real threat

If Iraq and the United States go to war in the desert, the odds are improving that two nuclear-armed nations will face each other across open sights for the first time.

Without question Saddam Hussein's atomic scientists are capable of turning out the combinations of high explosives and electronics necessary to initiate a nuclear explosion. The physics of nuclear weapons is well known, and fabrication of the actual bombs is not difficult for a country, such as Iraq, that makes its own conventional munitions and long-range rockets.

And Iraq has 27 pounds of uranium in its possession, provided by the French as part of the Osirak reactor project, which is ample for the construction of at least one nuclear weapon.

Scientists are unlikely to produce devices that are either crude, heavy or low in yield. While probably not light enough to fit on the tip of one of Iraq's locally modified "Scud" missiles, an Iraqi atomic bomb would surely be light enough to be delivered by fighter plane, either MIG or Mirage, and more powerful than the weapon that flattened Nagasaki.

Nuclear weapon designs which seem to be far more advanced than those used against Japan have surfaced in the press in the United States and, more important, in Sweden. Scientists working on Sweden's now-defunct nuclear weapons project knew that they could have produced lightweight and efficient bombs. The Swedes were also confident that their devices would have worked as planned, even without testing.

If Iraq implements Swedish-type designs using the same care and attention to detail it has shown in its adaptations of Soviet Scud missiles and the construction of its own autonomous motor launch boats in an area that has enough nuclear fuel for at least two atomic weapons. If he can obtain relatively small

amounts of plutonium to enrich the mixture, it is not impossible that his scientists could produce as many as three nuclear charges.

The smallest particle of fuel ever used to produce a nuclear explosion is far less than the "trigger quantities" that supposedly mark the minimum needs for a weapon. These international limits are politically negotiated ceilings, not scientifically established thresholds.

In the months preceding the Aug-2 invasion of Kuwait, Iraq entered the international marketplace to acquire the capacitors and krypton tubes used in some modern nuclear weapons. The system of controls on the sale of such nuclear-capable components apparently worked in part and limited the number that Iraq could obtain. While neither device is necessary (neither was used by the weapon-makers of Los Alamos in 1945), Iraq's purchases give an important clue to the progress of its nuclear weapons program and the intentions of Saddam Hussein.

If Iraq's nuclear weapons project were years away from producing its first bomb, there would have been little need to seek out hardware that is useful only in the "endgame," when implosion systems are fitted to fissile material. Iraq's plunge into the atomic market last summer was probably the first tick of a countdown clock that needs less than a year to reach zero.

Iraq's scientists will need to do some experimenting to produce bombs in which they can have confidence, but those experiments need not involve nuclear explosions or more than a thumbnail of uranium. The tests required to verify the construction of a nuclear weapon and the implosion explosives will produce no perceptible nuclear yield, and can be carried out in any munitions factory, mine

or quarry. They are unlikely to have a distinctive signature observable by U.S. or Soviet spy satellites. Adequate test instrumentation can be improvised from simple equipment not much more sophisticated than a cork agitator some pins.

The United States, and the other allied nations facing Iraq, might not know the status of the Iraqi weapons program until Saddam Hussein himself chose to make an announcement, perhaps an explosive one.

The West has pretended to limit nuclear proliferation by controlling access to the kind of equipment its laboratories would use today to design or build nuclear arms. It is far more important to eliminate the availability of the essential fissile isotopes, pure plutonium-239 and highly enriched uranium-235. Nuclear weapons are made with both isotopes, not only highly fissile material, and Saddam Hussein has highly enriched uranium in his pantry.

So long as Iraq claims that it is not making a bomb, its nuclear facilities are subject to only intermittent inspection by officers of the International Atomic Energy Agency. A audit of Iraq's uranium, which is under international sale, was conducted recently; another is not scheduled until long after the Jan. 15 deadline. Only a few weeks need pass from the time the deal is broken until the uranium is incorporated into nuclear weapons.

The United States and its allies may be about to learn the value of uranium in the hands of a dictator, and the futility of Western attempts to thwart nuclear proliferators by restricting their access to peripheral technologies.

Far from gulf, administration overlooks deadly street wars

WASHINGTON — As political lions droned back from New Year's vacations, there was an air of unequity in their war talk. From White House to Pentagon to the Capitol, the Imperial City was obsessed with war monomania. Would Saddam blink? Would there be war in the gulf? When would it start? How long would it last?

But while the president prepared to fight for oil and honor 6,000 miles away, a real war raged on his doorstep. Plenty of firepower and body bags if anyone cared.

It's the War of the Streets. Sometimes, not always, it's fought over drugs. Sometimes over basketball shoes or a gold chain or a jacket. Sometimes because a gun-toting youth imagines he's been "killed."

It adds up to a record 703 homicides in the Washington area in 1990. The city of marble and monuments was the title of Murder Capital USA.

As in any war, real people wind up on cold slabs. A young secretary returning home from a federal job, baby in her arms, child by the hand, is accosted by a man asking for money. Refused, he kills her.

The kid brother of Len Bias, Maryland basketball star whose cocaine death grabbed national attention, angers a stranger in a mall. Bias is killed in a car-to-car fusillade. On a sunny afternoon, a car drives by a street corner spraying 9mm bullets. Five children, ages 6 to 15, are wounded. The shooters are under 16. "There's a total disrespect out there for human life," says D.C. Police Chief William Falwood.

Not that the War in the Streets ends at the Washington Beltway. There were record murders in 1990 in Philadelphia, New York, Boston, Dallas and 15 other cities. Homicides were up 20 percent in big U.S. cities. The 11,832 murders by gunfire — equal to the deadliest years of the Vietnam War — could start the bloodiest decade in U.S. history. Why the wild West came to the stereo-

type of street hoods shooting each other over drug money no longer holds. Police say drug-related murders are down from 70 to 45 percent.

No, there's something more ominous, baffling and pervasive about the 1990s War in the Streets: Cheap guns, cheap lives. Cops speak with awe of 13-year-olds going to school armed like Mafia hit men. "In my day, you had a beef, you used your fists," says a D.C. cop. "These kids say, 'I got my nine (9mm). I'll spray you.' They'll pull out a piece, bang away. They'll drive past, shoot up a gun. Life doesn't mean a damn."

Civil control, thanks to the National Rifle Association's watering of politicians, seems a fading Utopia. D.C.'s strict firearm laws are mocked by guns flooding from other states. Congress, with no help from NRA lifetime member George Bush, stalled on banning paramilitary assault guns.

Now — would I make this up? — the NRA wants to legalize machine guns. Are bazookas next?

Poverty, joblessness and hopelessness play into a gun-kid's culture that cheapens life. It's becoming a wasted generation; 83 percent of D.C. murder victims were black males.

So cops make chalk outlines on the sidewalk of the first 1991 bodies. An argument over a cocaine bag or a couple of bucks or a "turf squabble" in D.C., Philly, Boston and a dozen cities, the War of the Streets heads for a new record.

At the White House, Bush flack Martin Fitzwater shrugged off the homicide epidemic as "very disturbing."

Then Washington returned to its obsession over the Persian Gulf oil battle.

Anybody wonder if we're fighting the wrong war?

Small-boaters want quiet too

It's very true that there are several places along the Snake River for motorboats to enjoy. Those spots are wide open for motorboats to water ski and to go fast! However, there are no spots for small motorcraft to escape the noise and racket produced by these motor-boats.

There are two major types of motorcraft in the Magic Valley — the fast and powerful boats that are used primarily for waterskiing and speed and the small boats that are used primarily for fishing and cruising. However, there are no boating areas that are specifically designed to provide the optimum environment for the small motorboat craft.

I enjoy boating in an area that is quiet and free of the racket that is produced by a powerful water-ski boat. Unfortunately, there are no areas near Twin Falls with that exclusive opportunity, and the only time I'm able to enjoy such solitude is on a rare weekday in the late fall of the year when the water skiers have finally given up for the year.

The county has a rare opportunity to provide the small motorboat owners and the non-motorized boaters one place along the Snake River where we can enjoy the quiet and solitude of the water and the beauty of the surrounding area of the Snake River. Therefore, I propose that the county limit the boating in the Centennial Waterfront Park to a "no wake" regulation and thus protect the area from the potential noise pollution of the "fast-lane" boaters.

Most boaters are owners of recreational boats in the Magic Valley who desire the same boating environment as the "muscle-motors" mariners. We do pay fuel taxes plus annual boat registration fees for boating facilities. Also, many of us contributed to the

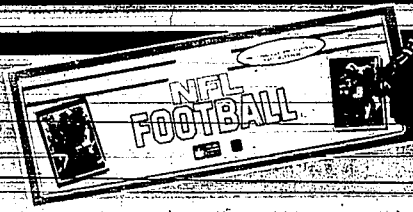

Lost scene will make it into 'Dances With Wolves' video

HOLLYWOOD — Nearly everyone involved in the making of a film bemoans a favorite scene that ends up on the cutting-room floor.

The rough cut of Orion Pictures' "Dances With Wolves" — the story of a U.S. soldier befriended by a tribe of Sioux — includes a scene for survival against invading whites — came in at over five hours, and two hours had to be chopped. Film editor Neil Travis had no trouble picking the scene he and director-producer-star Kevin Costner would most like to save.

"It's the scene we call the Broken Forest scene," Travis says of footage shot in the Grand Tetons of Wyoming. "Kicking Bird (Graham Greene) takes Dunbar (Costner) to a sacred place in the hills. They ride through this beautiful mountain meadow, full of aspens — it's an absolutely gorgeous scene."

"And when they come to the middle of it, it's been despoiled by (white) trappers — an acre or two right in the middle of sacred grounds, dead trees, animal carcasses, litter — both men are in tears."

"It hurt us to take it out. But it was just something that had to go."

The good news: A four-hour version of "Dances" is planned either for videocassette or a network miniseries, Travis says, and the Broken Forest scene "will definitely make it in."

"Home Alone" was the biggest movie hit of 1990 in the Magic Valley, while rap artist M.C. Hammer made the biggest waves in popular music locally and nationwide.

The Times-News surveyed local people involved in the entertainment industry to find out what was hot in 1990 and what might sizzle in 1991. Here is what we found.

MOVIES

"The number one picture in the Magic Valley by far was 'Home Alone,'" says Lar-

ry Roper, former executive vice president of Roper moviegoers are returning to see "Home Alone" for the fourth or fifth time, Roper says. The rowdy movie starring impish Macaulay Culkin is "a good, all-around picture" that has appealed to all ages, he adds.

Like the Hollywood Reporter trade journal, Roper ranked the top films starting with the Christmas 1989 releases and running through the end of 1990. Nationally, "Ghost" was the top-grossing movie and "Home Alone" placed fifth.

The rest of the year's special-Top 10 winners: "Ghost," "Daddy's Women," "Back to the Future-Part II," "Back to the Future-Part III," "The Hunt for Red October," "Dances With Wolves," "Young Guns II," "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" and "Quigley Down Under."

The local Top 10 differed somewhat from the national list, Roper notes. For example, "Quigley Down Under" and "Young Guns II" did better here than they did elsewhere, perhaps because of their Western themes. Nationally, the Academy Award-winning Best Picture "Driving Miss Daisy" placed ninth; here, it ranked 21st.

"Dick Tracy" was another film that made a comparatively weaker showing in Twin Falls, placing 22nd here compared to 10th nationally, Roper says, adding that the film suffered from its tremendous hype and "too many gimmicks."

Roper says he thinks "Godfather III," "Dances with Wolves" and "Havana" will be the leaders in Oscar nominations.

He also anticipates good business for "Awakenings," a film that has already opened in major cities. The movie stars Robert DeNiro and Robin Williams, and it could be another "Raip Man," Roper says.

MUSIC

M.C. Hammer's "You Can't Touch This" was probably the top-requested single for 1990, according to Don Craig, program/music director and morning disc jockey for Z-103 in Jerome.

Other acts popular with area listeners during 1990 were Vanilla Ice and Wilson Phillips. "I would call them maybe the top group of the year," Craig says of Wilson Phillips, three young women who are the daughters of Beach Boy Brian Wilson and John Phillips of the Mamas and the Papas. "I'm guessing they'll get best new artist in all the upcoming awards."

Kathy Hurst, manager of the Sound Socket record store in Ketchum, says George Michael's "Listen without Prejudice, Volume 1," Paul Simon's "Rhythm of the Sistas," Janet Jackson's "Rhythm Nation 1814" and Eric Clapton's "Journeyman" albums were all among the year's top sellers.

She predicts a trend toward dance music through 1991, but expects singers like Bob by Brown will prevail over rap artists. Hurst adds that Harry Connick Jr. and Frank Sinatra were popular in 1990 among jazz buffs, and classic rock favorites, including Pink Floyd, Jimi Hendrix and The Doors continue to sell well and win new audiences.

Z-103's Craig says he sees a continuing split in pop music, noting that in many markets, radio stations have switched to playing either rap/dance hits or rock Top 40, but not both.

Two bands Craig sees growing in fame during 1991 are Concrete Blonde and Trixter. Concrete Blonde has already won over many "alternative-rock" listeners. Trixter, Craig says, is hard to describe. "I think that's what might make them big," he adds. "They don't sound like somebody else."

On the country side of the fence, "The Dance" by Garth Brooks, "Walkin' Away" by Clint Black and "Home" by Joe Diffie were the top three songs for the year nationally.

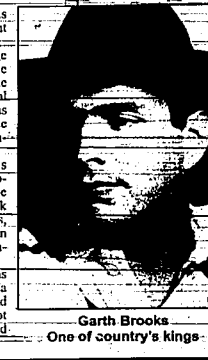

Museum puts on show of Rockwell's flops

STOCKBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) — He's famous for his homespun eloquence and the puckish charm of his portraits of young Americans banked their way in the 20th century. But even Norman Rockwell occasionally goofed.

From an unflattering portrait of a cow's posterior to a baseball study with the umpire looking the wrong way, works that Rockwell banked to a drawer are getting a second look in a new exhibit at the Norman Rockwell Museum.

It's called "Flops!" "It was sort of as a joke the idea started," said curator Maureen Hart Hennessy.

But after it began to take shape, organizers realized the exhibit, which takes its title from a chapter in Rockwell's autobiography, showed a new side of the illustrator and shook up the museum's routine.

"I think sometimes there's a tendency to think that we're some kind of shrine to Rockwell and that's not true," she said.

Of his own work, Rockwell wrote that sometimes he found "I've been molding a handful of air."

But some of the pictures hanging in a room of the blue-white house that houses the museum hardly seem to merit Rockwell's scorn.

"We're not saying that these things are flops," Hennessy said. Guides occasionally ask visitors if they agree with Rockwell's assessment of his work. "It's raised a lot of good questions for us."

One piece dominates the room: a large panoramic mural of the Soviet, British and U.S. ambassadors sitting at a session of the U.N. Security Council. Behind them crowd about 70 faces, representing everyone from a typical U.S. family to starving children of the world.

In his autobiography, "My Adventures as an Illustrator," Rockwell tells of his travails with the work. He said he could not persuade U.S. Ambassadors Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. and Andrei Gromyko to stop Soviet delegate An-

drei Vishinsky from beaming.

But eventually, wrote Rockwell, the work seemed "empty and pretentious."

For another "flop," Rockwell went to the trouble of staging baseball players Stan Musial and Joe Garagiola for a picture of a burly umpire daintily sweeping home plate. All went well until Rockwell realized that a real umpire would never face the pitcher, turning his backside to the ground.

One of the flops simply failed to find an audience.

For a Saturday Evening Post cover that was supposed to be a whodunit, Rockwell posed several famous actors, ranging from Lillian Barymore to Lassie. All that was visible of the vic-

tim, Van Johnson, was a pair of legs with spats protruding from beneath a table. "Visual cues tip off the astute viewer to the method and murderer."

But the Post decided it just wasn't "up to scratch," Rockwell wrote. "The movie stars kill it," the editors said. "The readers will be so busy recognizing the stars that the idea will be lost."

What the failed pictures may show is an artist uncomfortable with famous subjects, Hennessy said.

"He says in his autobiography that he was more comfortable staying in his own back yard and painting his neighbors," she said.

Out of a seven-decade career that produced more than 3,000 works, Rockwell spent the last 25 years of

his life in Stockbridge, immortalizing the town's picturesque New England setting and several of its residents.

The small exhibit of flops, which opened in November and runs through January 1992, has been "getting a chuckle from very serious people," said museum spokeswoman Beatrice Snyder.

Perhaps the funniest picture in the room is a calendar illustration called Mrs. O'Leary's Cow. The cow is craning its neck to peer at a lighted lamp within striking distance of her left hind hoof.

"Turned out to be my worst failure," Rockwell observed in his book. "Not that it was a bad painting. But when we went to look at the rear end of a cow for twelve months?"

TV Guide spotlights TV's 1990 lowlights

RADNOR, Pa. (AP) — From an impostor who claimed to be the "Our Gang" character Buckwheat to a reinforced-Volvo in a car-crashing commercial, TV Guide magazine found lots worth zapping on television last year.

The Jan. 5 edition of TV Guide gives 1990 Zap awards to the most memorable botches and blunders on television in the last 12 months.

The awards are named for one of life's simple pleasures — hitting the TV remote control button when a hateful show, commercial or star appears on screen.

Volvo led the "Truth in Advertising" division for an advertisement that showed one of its cars surviving as a truck drove over its roof. The car had been specially reinforced during production of the ad — a fact the company says it was not aware of until after the spot aired.

The impostor who duped the producers of ABC's "20/20" by claiming to be the character Buckwheat from the classic "Our Gang" comedies won a share of the "phony baloney" award.

William "Billy" Thomas, the real Buckwheat, died in 1980.

The other half of the baloney went to Milli Vanilli, stripped of the Grammy for Best New Artist after it was revealed the duo hadn't sung any of the songs on their debut album.

Other ZAP awards went to: The 5.5 on the Hypo-Scalor award to NBC, for promoting its TV movie "The Big One: The Great Los Angeles Earthquake," with a series of news releases on

earthquakes. One was headlined: "Major Quake Felt in Southern California. Just Four Days Before."

Kathie Lee Gifford, for telephoning her syndicated show "Regis and Kathie Lee" from her hospital bed March 22 to report that she'd given birth at 1:32 a.m.

A complaint by the U.S. Council on Energy Awareness to the Fox network about showing cartoon character Homer Simpson as a bumbling nuclear power plant worker.

Dweezil Zappa for his assessment of "Normal Life," the short-lived CBS sitcom in which he and his sister, Moon Unit Zappa, costarred. It's not brain surgery.

Rosanne Barr, for her off-key, off-color performance of the National Anthem before a San Diego baseball game.

The Peacock Award for most expensive wardrobe budget went to the CBS superhero "The Flash," who has eight suits, each costing more than \$25,000.

The Stupid Human Trick award for an obsessed fan who broke into David Letterman's house for the sixth time in two years.

The "What's the \$12 Million Dollar Toilet?" award to the Japanese TV network that reportedly paid that much to the Soviet Union to take a newsmen on a space mission. The newsmen complained about the zero-gravity toilet, she was a chain-smoker who missed his cigarettes and announced he hadn't brought along enough underwear.

'Teen money machines' bring in top concert cash

In 1989, the world's oldest rock band set a concert record by selling \$98 million in tickets for its "Steel Wheels" tour (and that was just in the United States and Canada). According to Pollstar, the concert magazine, the Rolling Stones are counted for nearly \$1 in every \$10 spent on tickets, and four times what the surprising fifth-place finishers did.

Well, last year, the Stones worked overseas and the New Kids on the Block moved to the top slot in Pollstar's year-end survey, grossing \$74.1 million from 152 shows in 123 cities. What Pollstar calls "the teen money machines" accounted for the second-highest-grossing tour ever and set a record for tickets sold, 3,291,987 (38,424 more than the Stones).

The magazine goes to great lengths to ferret out accurate information in a business that likes to keep its true numbers close to the vest.

acts hit that million-dollar mark: the Grateful Dead at \$147.62 million, Madonna at \$133,377. Despite their top overall gross, the New Kids' average of \$607,460 was only sixth on a per-show basis. None of the Pollstar figures factor in on-site merchandising sales, which in the Kids' case probably doubled the revenue for the tour.

A number of acts suspected of lip-synching at least portions of their concerts did well: Janet Jackson's fifth-place finish in total grosses was especially impressive, since it was also the first time she had her performance in concert. Milli Vanilli came in at No. 32, grossing \$9.5 million with 75 shows in 74 cities. Still, though they sold lots of records, only five dance-oriented acts made the Top 50 tour list: New Kids, Jackson, Hammer, Madonna and Vanilli.

Of Pollstar's Top 50 tours, nine were headlined by women (Jackson, Madonna, Cher, Heart, Anita Baker, the Judds, Diana Ross, Reba McEntire and Linda Ronstadt) and two by bands fronted by women (Fleetwood Mac). Six featured black acts (Jackson, Hammer, Baker, Milli Vanilli, Ross and Luther Vandross). The only rap act in the Top 50 was Hammer.

DEAR PARENT: I have had many letters from sightless people asking me to remind sighted people of the important message in your letter. A major complaint: When a blind person is accompanied by a sighted person while traveling, the sighted person will be asked, "And what will your friend have?"

Sex, glamour saga queen launches 6th book

Female mystery writers show crime makes no gender distinctions

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) — They've gotten away with murder, but only on the pages of their books.

Robin-based mystery writers Linda Barnes, Susan Kelly, Jane Langton and Katherine Hall Page are among the women who continue to make inroads in the territory carved out by Arthur Conan Doyle and Raymond Chandler, among others.

However, their protagonists—whether amateurs puzzled by the death of a friend or full-fledged private detectives—are named Liz or Carotta, instead of Sam or Sherlock.

"Women mystery writers are getting more attention," said Katherine Matter, owner of Kate's Mystery Books in Cambridge. "They go into areas that men can't."

Last weekend, a number of New England-based mystery writers gathered at Kate's to give fans and compare notes on trends and styles.

"Hot pink copies of Barnes' latest Carotta Carlyle mystery, 'Coyote,' were thrust at the author for autographs which she signed with a flourish."

Barnes, an established author of the "Michael Sprague" series, said, "There were no detectives at that time that behaved the way I felt a real woman would."

After a short story featuring Carotta—a 6-foot, redheaded, part-time cabbie and part-time private eye—proved to be a hit, three novels followed.

Barnes sees no limit to the public appetite for female detectives. "That's a question that Tony Hillerman or Robert Parker doesn't have to answer," she said, referring to two well-known mystery writers. "Most mystery fans read a lot of books. I can't write a book a day. But many of my readers read a book a day."

Cambridge-based author Kelly says female detectives are overcoming credibility problems with male readers.

"I've once, could I, believe a woman could handle a gun or peer into the twisted canyons of a psychopath's mind."

Kelly's creation, Liz Connors, is a free-lance crime writer who lives in Cambridge. "Until Proven Innocent" is her latest adventure.

Liz is a tough customer, who can handle herself in a life-and-death situation, thanks to creator Kelly who has taught police-report writing at police academies and counts a forensic pathologist among her frequent dinner guests.

But not all female mystery writers have female protagonists. Langton of Lincoln writes meticulously researched mysteries often set in well-known New England locations, such as "Murder at the Gardner," set in the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum.

A soft-spoken lady with gray hair, she shudders when asked about her sublimely murdering her victims, saying earnestly, "I'm a terribly nice lady. I like solving some puzzles. I hate to bother with real actual police work."

An upcoming book will feature a battle between developers and conservationists, she said.

Page's feisty culinary expert Faith Sibley Fairchild is a minister's wife, with a baby in tow, who begins to solve mysteries to fight household boredom. In "The Body in the Kelp," she finds clues in a family quilt.

Susan Conant, who also trains dogs, has developed Holly Winter, a dog trainer who finds her secret tracking down killers in "A New Leash on Death" and "Dead and Doggone," both aimed at dog lovers and mystery fans.

"As a mystery reader, I found myself reading—mysteries by women written with strong women characters," she said. "To a certain extent, I like to write those books. I like to read."

If there is any pattern to female detective fiction, it is that while male hard-boiled detectives are loners, even single female detectives have some kind of family around them, although it's not a traditional husband-and-kids, Barnes said.

"It's more the way that women live, that friendships are important," she said. "Carotta is not concerned with justice as maintaining relationships. She's concerned about what's going to happen after the books end."

LOS ANGELES (AP) — When she first hit best-seller lists a dozen years ago with her steamy novel "Scruples," Judith Krantz thought it was a fluke, a magical midlife gift that would never come again.

"I was in shock for two years," she says of the book-sales bonanza that set the publishing world on its ear. "I put one foot in front of another and did what a person does on a 15-day book tour when you have a No. 1 best seller. But I didn't know what I was doing."

Now, launching her sixth book, "Dazzle," another in the sex-and-glamour sagas that have made her famous, the acclaimed queen of escapist pop literature recalls her first overnight success as fondly as a first love affair.

She still wears the golden cuff bracelet from her husband, producer Steve Krantz, to commemorate the "Scruples" publication. It reminds her of that star burst of fame and fortune that sent her into orbit as a best-selling author.

Krantz, who has since sold books and miniseries for millions, still savors the memory of her first \$50,000 advance.

"Scruples" was published two days after her 50th birthday and, for this former free-lance magazine writer and Beverly Hills wife and mother, a new life had begun.

When she hit the best-seller list she ran out of money, so she bought a pair of diamond earrings. "I took refuge in the one thing I was sure of—shopping.... It had never occurred to me there was money in this," she says of her book writing.

But there was life after "Scruples," and Krantz, fearful of being swayed by fame's dizzying whirl, retreated to her typewriter.

"I started another book so I had a feeling of being grounded," she said. "I started 'Princess Daisy' as soon as possible. It returned me to a routine of working."

She was still uncertain that success would last.

"I never took for granted that I would write a second book and I never envisioned that one day you and I would be sitting here and I would be lunch in her bright, flowered Beverly Hills home."

Her second book had publishing history. Paperback rights were auctioned for \$3.2 million, then the highest price ever for reprint rights.

Judith Krantz, a multimillionaire in her own right. She had a following. Her subsequent books, "Mistral's Daughter," "I'll Take Manhattan" and "Till We Meet Again," were scooped up by faithful readers and by television.

But there was a downside to Krantz' success; the critics snubbed her.

"I took criticism in the press as someone snatching money out of the mouths of those deserving writers," she recalls. "They didn't understand that if publishers make money on best sellers they can afford to work from other authors. They had profits from my books that they could put into risk taking."

This morning Westley College English major knows she is not writing serious literature.

"I think I write about things that are serious in the lives of my characters but not in a serious way. My style is not a serious style. It's a playful style," she says.

SEX is a key ingredient in Krantz books, and "Dazzle" contains more explicit sex scenes than ever, including a lesbian episode.

Why does she focus so heavily on sex?

"I like to write about it," she says matter-of-factly. "I love to write erotic, sensual scenes. I found I had a talent for writing about sex and I like to exercise that talent. Besides, I don't feel I know my characters in a completely rounded way unless I know about their sex lives. It's like the color of their hair."

Krantz prides herself on factual research for each book. She explored the Beverly Hills boutique business in "Scruples," the world of advertising agencies in "Princess Daisy," Nazi collaborators in "Mistral's Daughter" and World War II flying aces in "Till We Meet Again."

The heroine of "Dazzle" is a beautiful photographer of celebrities who also is heir to an Orange County, Calif., Spanish land grant threatened by development. That subject is as carefully delineated as her characters' wardrobes and sexual appetites.

"You can't keep a novel going on just sex and clothes," says Krantz. "Nobody would read it. You've got to have real characters and real problems."

As "Dazzle" hits the bookstores with a glitzy gold cover, Krantz is starting a new book. She writes now, she says, for love, not money, and certainly not for posterity.

"I was writing for posterity, as an English major I would have to laugh at myself," she says. "I don't think I'll come back in another life and see kids reading my books in high school."

'Home Alone' leads weekly box office receipts

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Home Alone" and "Godfather Part III" led the weekly box office, sweepingstakes combining to a \$45 million New Year's holiday take, with "Ghost" materialized as the biggest hit of 1990.

"Home Alone" took in an estimated \$22 million to take the No. 1 position in the five-day holiday box office tally, followed by "Godfather

Part III" in second with more than \$20 million, according to preliminary figures, released by Exhibitor Relations Co. Inc.

Muscling into third was Arnold Schwarzenegger's "Kindergarten Cop" with \$17 million. Fourth went to Kevin Costner's "Dances With Wolves" with \$12 million, and the fifth-place finisher was "Look Who's Talking Too" with \$9.3 million.

Sixth place went to "Edward Scissorhands," followed by "Three Men & a Little Lady," "Misery," "Mermaids" and "Russian House."

Two big-budget movies did poorly. "Bonfire of the Vanities" took in only \$4.9 million and "Havana" grossed just \$2 million.

The holiday box office period began Friday and ended Tuesday.

'Godfather' fans should enjoy 'Part III'

The much-awaited, much-publicized "Godfather Part III" should please those people who have followed this saga that began with the original film in 1972.

The third film has the same texture, the same kind of passion that distinguished the first two movies.

Review

The closing sequence is a little florid, but then the "Godfather" movies have always been operatic in their style, and the sequence is as well as it did when Alfred Hitchcock used it.

The new film takes place 20 years after the events in the second film. It is 1979, and Michael Corleone (Al Pacino), now in his sixties, is living in New York where he is leading the family life. Over the "shubler" business, as well as the "family" are out of the rackets and into legitimate investment.

Our pasts, however, have a way of catching up with us, and Corleone's does with him. His trouble begins when Joey Zasa, played by Joe Mantegna, takes over the "shubler" business Corleone left behind. He is, for instance, dealing in drugs, and because Corleone represents opposition Zasa does not want, he makes a grand attempt on Michael's life.

This is a particularly imaginative incident, even for the "Godfather" movies, and it is matched, or close, by the finale which takes place at the Palermo Opera House where Corleone's son, who has chosen a singing career, is doing the lead in "Cavalleria Rusticana" and the opera singers engage in operatic skullduggery on stage; there are similar doings in the boxes and the halls leading to those boxes.

The ending is not cliché, and we wish that Francis Ford Coppola, who produced and directed the film, had used another denouement, but that's how it is with this film, one that is, over all, strong enough to make us overlook the weaknesses.



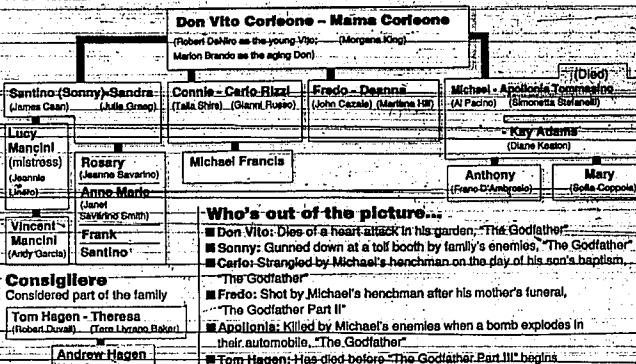

The 'Godfather' story as it happened so far

The "Godfather" saga begins with faith or doubt, depending on your point of view.

The opening speech of the first movie is an "Inimitable" praise of the United States. But the opening moment chronologically is the event that sends young Vito Corleone to New York, where he will establish a powerful-crime family — is the murder of his parents and brother by a Sicilian don.

Sixteen years have passed since Francis Ford Coppola and Mario Puzo spent six weeks telling the story of the Corleones. Here's what has happened so far: Vito emigrates in 1917, working in a grocery store until a gangster forces the owner to hire his nephew instead. Vito, who has concealed weapons for his neighbors, is repaid by the Corleones with a stolen rug. Vito now embarks on a life of crime.

He shoots the gangster who had him fired and takes over the man's extortion practices, performing them more politely and requesting "favors" in return. Later, he returns to Sicily and stalks the man who had his family members shot.

Vito has three sons: hatted Santino (Sonny), withdrawn Fredo and intelligent Michael. By 1945, Michael has become a war hero and Fredo has all but disappeared, leaving Sonny free to inherit the business. A sister, Connie, has married a no-good named Carlo.

Old Corleone keeps doing "favors," he wins a movie part for singer Johnny Fontane by decapitating a stallion belonging to an uncooperative producer. Meanwhile, the Corleones are at war for their New York turf with the Tattaglia family. Each side kills

the others' henchmen, until the Tattaglias try to assassinate Don Vito.

In reprisal, Michael shoots two high-ranking members of Tattaglia's clan and goes into hiding overseas. He returns and is widowed almost immediately. Back in the States, the Tattaglia gun Sonny down. Fredo can't run the family, and the old man is too sick, so Michael returns. He marries Kay Adams, an old WASP. He promises to legitimize the Corleones will be legitimate within five years.

The aging don, still nominally the family's head, reluctantly lets the drug trade move through his territory under the influence of Barzini, another big name. Michael wages all-out war on his enemies, wiping them out (including Carlo, who set Sonny up for the Tattaglias).

By 1958, Michael has moved the family headquarters to Las Vegas and is one in Reno; at the same time, he's cutting an enormous real-estate deal with Miami gangster Hyman Roth. After a murder attempt — presumably by an associate who's loyalty Roth bought — Michael goes undercover. He visits Havana, but a business scheme there falls through.

A congressional committee investigating organized crime seems to have the Corleones on the ropes, but witnesses decide not to testify. Meanwhile, Michael has learned the traitor is Fredo; after their mother dies, he orders the executions of Fredo and Hyman Roth.

Kay, long a prisoner in her own home, reveals she has a secret child and is leaving her husband. Michael retains custody of his son and daughter, but he has no close friends and no adult family on whom to lean. He must manage the dynasty alone.





Legendary bank robber John Dillinger brought back to life in ABC TV movie

By Christopher Hull

Relax, doll, says John Dillinger to a frightened bank clerk early in ABC's "Dillinger" (airing Sunday, Jan. 6). "The money ain't yours. It belongs to the bank. They stole it in the first place." Maybe he really said it, and maybe he didn't, but the line is typical of the stories that sprung up around one of the most legendary gangsters ever to foam the American heartland.

Mark Harmon stars as Dillinger in the movie, and Sheryl Fenn plays Billie Frechette, one of his female companions.

Also appearing are Will Patton as Melvin Purvis, the FBI agent in charge of tracking Dillinger down, and Vince Edwards as FBI director J. Edgar Hoover.

According to Harmon, playing the role of Dillinger offered him the opportunity to really look into the legend of a folk figure whom he had been hearing about most of his life. "When the script came along, I was fascinated with the idea of the character," he says. "My dad was raised in Indiana, so I grew up hearing stories about John Dillinger."

Following a nine-year stint in prison for a botched robbery, Dillinger embarked on a 14-month crime spree that saw him become America's most wanted fugitive. Dillinger captured the nation's imagination and earned the FBI's wrath by committing a series of daring robberies and escaping from custody twice.

Eventually, in 1934, he was unwittingly betrayed by a woman he had been seeing and was gunned

down in front of the Biograph Theatre in Chicago after watching Clark Gable face death in "Manhattan Melodrama."

"Back in the 1930s," says Harmon, "America was looking for someone, anyone, to follow or get behind — especially someone who was taking it to the bankers. So you could see how people would be interested in him. He was a fan of Jesse James, and he liked Cary Grant and Humphrey Bogart."

"So once he jumped a counter and stood up there and started spinning his gun and smiling behind it — which was something that he had seen in the movies — the press picked up on it, and it became part of the myth. At some point, I think that he started trying to live up to the myth."

There was one instance where Dillinger came out of a bank vault

and saw a chrome-plated .45 in the bank president's desk drawer. He grabbed it and stuck it in his pants.

Then on the way out of the bank he walked past a farmer in bib overalls with his hands in the air and a smek of money on the counter in front of him.

Dillinger said, "Hey, Pop, is that yours or the bank's?" And the farmer said, "That's mine son." And Dillinger said, "Well then, you keep it. We don't steal your money, just the bank's."

While shooting in Wisconsin, Harmon actually had the opportunity to meet a woman who claimed to have met Dillinger.

about grown children. Can that be true? — M.R.

A: Let's just say that Catherine has packed a whole lot of loving into her 47 years. I ran into her at a film festival in, of all places, Sarasota, Fla. Deneuve introduced me to Christian Vadim, her 27-year-old son by director Roger Vadim. Deneuve also chatted about her 18-year-old daughter, Chiara, whose father is Italian actor Marcello Mastroianni. If raising these two wasn't enough, Deneuve has found time to push a major cosmetics line and star in some 60 movies.

Q: Has it ever happened that an actor has been nominated twice as Best Actor for playing the same character in different films? — K.G.

A: Amazingly enough, it has — not once, but twice. Bing Crosby was up for "Going My Way" and "The Bells of St. Mary's," and Al Pacino for "The Godfather" and "Godfather II." It might happen again, according to studio insiders who've had a look at Sylvester Stallone's performance in "Rocky V." Stallone got nominations for the original "Rocky" in 1976 (as actor and writer) and could repeat either in both categories when nominations are announced.

Q: What can you tell me about the new TV talk show that will co-star Robert Wagner and his new wife, Jill St. John? — B.S.

A: I sent my London spy to question Jill about that recently while she was backstage watching her husband act in the British version of a play titled, appropriately enough, "Love Letters." Or, maybe Jill was keeping an eye on Bob's on-stage co-star and old TV mate, Stefania Powers. Anyway, Jill was asked if she and Wagner plan to co-star on TV. Calling herself strictly a "backstage wife," Jill told me she's content to "play with him at home."

Q: Isn't it true that veteran crooner Tony Martin was once forced to sing for gangsters in order to make ends meet? — A.R.

A: Yes, but then practically every star who sang in Las Vegas did. Martin, 77, recently celebrated his 42nd year of performing in the gambling town and remembers singing there when many of the casinos were openly controlled by members of organized crime. Q: What about those rumors that John Candy didn't get along with Macaulay Culkin, the boy who stars in the movie, "Home Alone." Can Candy really be jealous of his scene-stealing cast member? — D.K.

A: Those rumors are completely out of character for John Candy. In truth, the comic actor (who does have a relatively small part in "Home Alone") was very gregarious on the set, leaving his dressing room door open to anyone who cared to drop in and hang out. This included young CULKIN, who was a frequent visitor, soaking up Candy's advice and humor. Plus, Macaulay appeared with Candy in the movie "Uncle Buck," which was the beginning of a warm relationship between the two actors that hasn't yet faltered.

Q: What's this about Kim Cattrall starving herself into a coma just to get an audition for a movie role? Is she that desperate for work? — I.B.

A: Kim tells me that in order to land a part in director Brian de Palma's "Bonfire of the Vanities," the movie version of Tom Wolfe's great book, she had to shed some unwanted pounds. So, the 34-year-old actress went on a weird diet that,

she told me, "separated carbohydrates from proteins. I got sick as the dickens. Never again." Kim now looks great — she was wearing a knockout navy blue Chanel suit when I saw her — and is preparing, dietless, for another movie part.

Q: Isn't Julie Andrews, underneath all that goody-two-shoes facade, really hell on wheels to deal with? What do you think? — A.R.

A: That rumor was around for a while, but I didn't believe it. And I was right. I stood next to Julie not long ago at a Hollywood function marking the 25th anniversary of "The Sound of Music," the great musical which propelled Andrews into stardom, and along with "Mary Poppins" stuck her with a permanent Miss Goody-Two-Shoes image. Julie has a saucy side to her — she once appeared topless in a movie directed by husband Blake Edwards. But more than that, she is a trooper. Julie stood for hours at the anniversary party patiently answering the same questions from an army of interviewers. She's a genuinely nice person.

Monty developing game plan for soap

The Battle of the Producers. Look out Bill Bell and number one, "The Young and the Restless." Gloria Monty is back at ABC determined to put "General Hospital" in the number one spot again.

Although Monty won't meet the press yet because her game plan is not complete, tension is way up in the soap's dressing rooms. The Latino characters received December pink slips. An experienced assistant disappeared late one Friday. And Gloria announced Anthony Geary would be returning this winter, but not as Luke Spencer.

What's next?

John Reilly, the affable Chicago actor, who was hired by Monty to play Sean Donely six years ago, hasn't a clue, but John is happy to see Gloria running things again.

"She created me (Sean)," says John. "She can also destroy me."

Reilly isn't really worried. His character was named one of daytime's sexiest men by a soap magazine, and his mail remains strong. Best of all, John hasn't been out of a job one day since moving to Hollywood, moving from job to job — soap, prime time TV, or the big screen.

"Things happen when Gloria is around," John observes. "She's hiring contract players, but that's all I know."

Reilly, who writes on the side, admires the lady for being smart enough to hire him in the beginning, and for having "total vision" for a soap. "Gloria will know exactly where she's going and how to get there. She has a long-range view, something key in her job as a daytime soap producer."

The actor used to enjoy the Monty note sessions, where Gloria gives her views on characters and performances, criticizing and encouraging, suggesting shadings, and different ways to go. "Gloria has great note sessions, the best I've seen," Reilly says. "If you're not mentioned it means you're on track for the moment."

What Gloria has in store for Sean Donely is not clear. When Sean first appeared, villainy was his game. Slowly Sean turned into a good guy

with a streak of larceny showing at times. He even displayed signs of vulnerability, and that hooked the ladies.

"To Sean friendship is important," Reilly continues. "But there are times I've been listening to the problems of everybody lately, a regular Mr. Reliable. I feel Sean is fast becoming the Welcome Wagon of Port Charles."

Writing TV pilot ideas and stories keeps the actor amused. He hasn't sold anything yet, but that doesn't deter the man. "As an actor you become a great editor," John explains. "So I have one asset. Most of the work is average and you accept that journeyman level and pray, if you're lucky you find a real

A: The 26-year-old Jasmine Guy says she looks "exotic," a word often used by people wondering about a performer's racial heritage. For the record, Jasmine's father is black; her mother is white. She packs plenty of pizzazz in her five-foot-three frame, and is nothing like the whiny, uptight character she portrays on "World," a spinoff from the "Cosby" show. A trained dancer who performed on Broadway, Jasmine is using her TV popularity to hype a new career as a singer.

Q: Isn't director Peter Bogdanovich getting tired of the media attention directed at his personal life? — A.M.

A: He is indeed tired of what he

views as misconceptions about his love life. Bogdanovich does hold a record of sorts in that no other filmmaker in recent years has appeared as a character in an unflattering manner — in so many other filmmaker's movies. They are "Irreconcilable Differences," "Star 80," "Death of a Centerfold: The Dorothy Stratten Story," and "Strangers Kiss."

Q: Isn't it true that, as portrayed by Shirley MacLaine in the "Postcards from the Edge" movie, Debbie Reynolds is an alcoholic? — R.E.

A: Debbie has consistently pointed out that the portions of "Postcards" that relate to MacLaine's character are strictly fiction. "I hope you realize that Carrie wrote it, but did not live it," Reynolds told me recently, referring to daughter Carrie Fisher. Debbie liked the movie, but denies she and her children ever argued. Reynolds concedes that Carrie did have at one point a serious drug problem. But, adds Debbie, "once and for all — I am not an alcoholic."

NBC News beams around the clock

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — NBC News launched its new 24-hour News Channel on New Year's Day, feeding video of late-breaking news, sports and features from a new base in Charlotte to network affiliates for local use.

Until now, the network had been feeding its affiliates several times a day from New York City.

"We were better off getting out of New York and creating our own identity," said Bob Homer, a former CBS News bureau chief who's now in charge of what he describes as "a vidgo wife service."

Real estate costs, climate and access to a major airport also played a role.

Charlotte is a thriving city with a good business climate," he said. "It's also blessed with strong local media."

NBC News Channel will feed raw and edited footage, including foreign, domestic and regional material, to local stations, which can then edit the reports for use on their newscasts.

"Local stations want more variety," Homer said. "Some smaller

companies, like CNN, have been more aggressive in using satellite technology to help individual stations."

For now, Homer and his staff of about 30 producers and editors are working out of temporary offices. Later this year, the NBC News Channel will move into a 10,000-square-foot wing of the new studio of the local NBC affiliate, WCNC.

Two weeks ago, NBC News signed the Nippon Television Network (NTV) as the News Channel's first overseas affiliate.

In exchange for exclusive rights to news material from the NBC News Channel, NTV will give NBC News the same rights to all Japanese and international news material of NTV, Japan's largest private broadcast network.

Homer said his staffers are experienced professionals who are used to working behind the scene.

"(CBS sportscaster) John Madden would love this team," he said, a reference to the former NFL coach's affection for unheralded football players, particularly linemen.

"It's not particularly glamorous

work but it's very interesting," Homer said. "I look for people who want to get the news on the air."

He said locating in Charlotte was not an effort to get away from unions.

"Although I know people have attributed different motives to this, that really isn't the problem. The work that was being done in New York was done by people who weren't in the union," Homer said.

"In terms of the business sense, we wanted to make sure we had a stable work force. People can't afford to live here. That was one of the factors that attracted us to Charlotte," he said.

"I think the greater consideration would have been that we were interested in a place that had a favorable ratio between relatively low cost of living and relatively high standard of life.

"It's also not dirt cheap, but it's relatively inexpensive. It allows me to pay fairly well here. I have the benefit of knowing it's going into the bank account of my employee and not into the pocket of a landlord in New York City."

CBS signs new long-term contract with 'Designing Women' creators

LOS ANGELES — The creators of television's hit comedy "Designing Women" have signed a CBS production deal that guarantees them five new series on the network, officials announced.

Linda Bloodworth-Thomson and Harry Thomason of Mozart Productions, which also makes the critically acclaimed CBS series "Evening Shade," have signed a long-term contract to create five programs exclusively for the network.

It is the largest series commitment ever made by CBS to a single production company, the

network said in a prepared statement.

The dollar amount was not revealed.

"We specifically wanted to get married to CBS," Bloodworth-Thomason said.

"This is a permanent arrangement."

The agreement is the second largest production deal of its kind at any of the big three networks. Stephen Bochco's 10-series deal with ABC is the biggest production contract with a single company.

Bloodworth-Thomason said all shows under the new CBS contract will likely be 30-minute situation comedies.

The subject matter and debut

dates have not been finalized, she said.

"Obviously we're not going to be running seven shows simultaneously," she said.

"Designing Women," a sharp-witted comedy about four female interior designers living in Atlanta, frequently breaks into the A.C. Nielsen Co.'s top 10 list.

"Evening Shade," featuring an ensemble cast, including Burt Reynolds, Hal Holbrook and Marlu Henner, has received favorable reviews.

The TV show was recently moved to CBS' highly rated Monday night lineup, alongside "Designing Women" and "Murphy Brown."

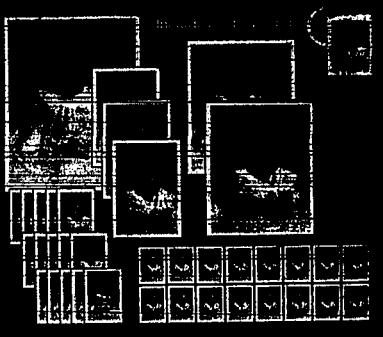
