DHAHRAN, Saudi Arabia—Iraq's elusive air force showed signs of life Thursday and sent two warplanes along the Saudi coast carrying the feared Exocet anti-ship missiles. Both fighters were promptly shot down.

Iraq mocked the allies for failing to launch a ground offensive, but allied commanders said they would stick to their game plan and intensify the around-the-clock air strikes on Iraq and occupied Kuwait.

The U.S. Navy scored a victory in the northern Persian Gulf, taking 51 Iraqis prisoner on a tiny Kuwait island and sinking an Iraqi minesweeper, American officials reported. They said a second minesweeper exploded and sank, apparently after hitting a mine while trying to escape.

Three Iraqis were killed on Qaruh Island Thursday in the latest action by the U.S. Navy along the Kuwaiti coast, where Iraqis have been sowing mines and installing anti-aircraft weapons on oil platforms.

The United States and Britain each lost a warplane during the night Wednesday. The American pilot was saved in a dramatic rescue after his jet was disabled by ground fire and he ejected over the gulf.

The two crewmen of the British Tornado GR-1 fighter-bomber are missing, British sources in Riyadh said.

The losses occurred as allied forces took advantage of clearing skies to step up their relentless air assault on Iraq and Kuwait. Many of the attacks concentrated on Iraq's elite Republican Guards, an Army spokesman said.

The Republican Guards, the backbone of the Iraqi armed forces, are a self-contained

military force with infantry, air defense, tanks, artillery, intelligence, special operations forces and medical and logistics support.

"We are hitting them with all assets available to us," U.S. Army Lt. Col. Greg Pepin said. He estimated that more than 150,000 of the guards are "well dug in" in Kuwait and southern Iraq.

The sorties are inflicting heavy damage on the guards, U.S. pilots and military commanders said Thursday, but neither provided casualty figures.

The allied tactics call for "softening up" the Iraqi forces from the air before trying to eject them from Kuwait by ground.

The number of allied sorties passed 15,000 on Thursday, Pepin said. Allied sources in Dhahran said the U.S.-led coalition wants to pick up the pace, perhaps flying

## Census says Magic Valley grew by 2.9%

WASHINGTON — Figures released Thursday make it official: Idaho has passed the 1 million mark in population, and has grown more than 70 percent since 1950.

The Magic Valley, defined as Twin Falls, Jerome, Cassia, Minidoka, Gooding, Blaine, Lincoln and Camas counties and Glenns Ferry in Elmore County, has grown 2.9 percent since 1980. As a state, Idaho has grown 6.6 percent in the last decade.

Twin Falls, with 27,591 people, is the state's sixth-largest city, and with 138,114 people, the eight-county Magic Valley includes 13.7 percent of the state's population.

The numbers mean the valley should not lose any representation, in terms of percentage, in the Legislature when it is reapportioned this year or next. With 14.2 percent of the state's population in 1980, the valley got to elect 18 lawmakers.

Boise remains the biggest city in Idaho, with 125,738 people, followed by Pocatello (46,080), Idaho Falls (43,929), Nampa (28,365), Lewiston (28,202) and Twin Falls.

Statistics from the U.S. Bureau of the Census also indicate that although Idaho was among the states that exceeded the national growth rate of 9.8 percent between 1950 and 1990, it fell below the national average during the last decade.

Idaho's population is 1,006,749 and Twin Falls County is home to 53,580 people, the statistics show, 1.2 percent more than a decade ago.

According to the 1980 Census, Idaho's population was 944,127. The city of Twin Falls had 26,209 residents a decade ago, 5.3 percent fewer than today.

Blaine County led the Magic Valley in growth over the last decade with 37.7 percent, from 9,841 in 1980 to 13,552 last year. It included south-central Idaho's three fastest-growing cities: Hailey (up 74.8 percent in a decade), Sun Valley (up 72.9 percent) and Bellevue (up 25.5 percent).

Other big Magic Valley winners were Murtaugh (up 17.5 percent) and Ketchum (up 14.7 percent).

Blaine, Twin Falls, Jerome and Cassia counties all grew in the last decade, Jerome by 2 percent from 14,840 to 15,138 and Cassia by 5 percent from 19,427 to 19,532. Minidoka, Gooding, Lincoln and Camas counties all lost people.

Camas County dropped 11.2 percent of its population, Lincoln County 3.7 percent, and Minidoka and Gooding counties 2 percent each.

## Illicit drug use among students wanes

WASHINGTON — Illegal drug use among young adults declined again last year, continuing a decade-long trend, but large numbers of them still drink and smoke regularly, according to an annual survey released Thursday.

The proportion of 1990 high school seniors who had ever used an illegal drug dropped to 47.9 percent, down 3 points from the prior year's class, the federally financed survey said. That was the lowest level since the survey began in 1975, and the first drop below 50 percent.

The level was highest in 1981, at 65.6

percent, and has dropped by about three points each year since 1988.

Officials attributed the decline in the use of marijuana, cocaine and other illegal drugs to less demand, rather than a reduction in supply — because the young people surveyed continued to report that the drugs are easy to get.

"We think this is a clear result of education efforts," said Dr. Louis Sullivan, secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services. Anti-drug messages are "convincing students that drugs are not a rite of passage but a road to disaster," he said.

By the time the Class of 1990 graduated,

nearly half of them had used an illicit drug at least once, a third reported drinking heavily within the prior two weeks and one in five smoked cigarettes daily, the survey showed.

Among college students within four years of high school, a third said they had used an illegal drug in the prior year, 41 percent reported heavy drinking in the previous two weeks and 12 percent smoked daily.

About a third of the high school graduates who earned their diplomas within the past 10 years reported heavy drinking within the prior two weeks and 21 percent said they smoked daily.

## Utah House streamlines, passes abortion measure

SALT LAKE CITY — The Utah House on Thursday passed an anti-abortion bill after stripping the measure of its most restrictive elements.

The unanticipated 53-20 vote returned the bill to the Senate, which one day before had passed a two-tiered bill that Gov. Norm Bangerter said he would sign.

However, the Republican governor hoped the amended bill would be greeted favorably by the Senate Friday and, barring major changes, still planned to sign it into law, said press secretary Francine Giannini.

"If we get it tomorrow and it remains palatable, we'll sign it," she said.

The 75-member House voted 41-31 to drop the strict first tier in favor of what many consider is a more constitutionally acceptable second tier. Even supporters had acknowledged the stricter elements would almost undoubtedly have been rejected by the U.S. Supreme Court.

"It makes no sense to pass a piece of legislation that will be declared unconstitutional," said Rep. Jerold Jensen, R-Salt Lake, in speaking for the amendment proposed by fellow Republican Afton Bradshaw.

Republican sponsor Evan Olsen warned the chamber that the amendment would doom the bill crafted by a task force and attorneys specializing in abortion litigation and endorsed by Bangerter.

The measure passed the Senate 23-5 on Tuesday. Because the bill originated in the Senate, that chamber will have to approve the amendment. Failing that, the bill would be taken up by a joint executive committee for further negotiation.

The bill's first tier would have banned abortions except in cases of rape or incest, if a woman's life were in jeopardy or if a doctor concluded the child would be born

with physical or mental defects "incompatible with sustained survival."

The second tier, included in the event the first was deemed unconstitutional, would permit abortion to prevent "grave damage to the pregnant woman's medical health" — including her mental health — and to prevent birth of a child with "grave defects."

The House also imposed a 20-week limit on abortions resulting from rape, incest or fetal defects, and reinstated a clause providing that in a serious medical emergency, the bill's provisions would not apply.

## Weather summary

The National Weather Service says a weak cold front moving south along the Continental Divide continued to produce light snow over central and eastern Idaho Thursday.

This system was expected to push out of the state Thursday night, but another is expected to arrive late today or Saturday. The weather should remain unsettled for the next few days as a fragmented storm track continues over the northwest.

Skies were mostly sunny to partly cloudy Thursday afternoon over the Panhandle and the southwest. Elsewhere skies were cloudy with scattered light snow showers. In advance of the front, windy conditions were reported over southern Idaho Thursday afternoon while the north had lighter breezes.

Precipitation amounts Thursday varied from traces to a few hundredths of an inch in valley locations.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 44 degrees at Lowell. Stanley reported the coldest at 9 degrees below zero.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the highest temperature was 83 degrees at Homestead, Fla. The lowest was 32 below zero at International Falls, Minn.

## Snow storm snarls travel in Southeast; rain falls as well

Snow closed schools and snarled traffic Thursday in South Carolina and northern Georgia. Rain fell elsewhere in the Southeast.

South Carolina Gov. Carroll Campbell ordered the closing of state offices in 36 of the state's 46 counties for "all but essential personnel" because of road conditions, said his spokesman, Tucker Eskew.

Clemson University and the University of South Carolina campuses in Columbia canceled classes because of the weather.

South Carolina businesses reported increased demands for winter items such as coats and boots that are normal winter attire in other parts of the country.

"People want coats, but we don't have any to sell them," said Pearl Nelson, area manager for Upton's at Anderson mall in Anderson. "We just got in our spring attire summer stock."

Northern Georgia had up to 6 inches of snow around Clarksville and in Lumpkin County by midday.

The University of Georgia canceled day and evening classes.

Georgia Department of Transportation spokesman Jerry

Stargel said major highways in the northern part of the state were passable but some secondary roads could be hazardous.

The storm produced rain in North Carolina and over the rest of Georgia. Heavy rain fell along the central Gulf Coast.

Rainfall totals for the six hours up to 1 p.m. EST included 1.40 inches at Alma, Ga.; 1.21 inches at Waycross, Ga.; 1.10 inches at Valdosta, Ga.; and 1.05 inches at Pensacola, Fla. In the 24 hours up to 8 a.m. EST, the Naval Air Station at Pensacola got 2.42 inches of rain and Mobile, Ala., got 1.77 inches.

Elsewhere, an upper level weather disturbance produced scattered snow showers across northern New England and southern sections of the Great Lakes region.

Light snow associated with a stationary front in the north-central states extended across Montana into parts of Wyoming and western South Dakota.

Temperatures were below freezing at midday from the northern and central high plains to New England.

Readings were in single digits or below zero at midday from North Dakota through the upper Mississippi Valley to Upper Michigan. International Falls, Minn., had a temperature of 13 below zero.

# 82nd Airborne sees Iraqi glint

WITH THE 82nd AIRBORNE DIVISION (AP) — The new headquarters of the 82nd Airborne Division's 2nd Brigade are now so far north in Saudi Arabia that the soldiers can see glint of Iraqi vehicles across the border.

"We're picking up windshield glints to the north," said Col. Ron Rokosz.

Two infantry battalions of the 2nd Brigade were deployed in front of headquarters, the exact location of which was undisclosed for security reasons.

"Put it this way, I don't smell the ocean," said Rokosz, 45, of Chicago, surveying a desolate expanse of rocky desert.

Some elements of the brigade were still moving north via convoys and C-130 Hercules transport

planes. "The objective now is to dig in and get every body here," Rokosz said.

Moving a brigade through the north in Saudi Arabia has been like handling the "A-10s," but it is a Herculean logistical task. It took scores of trucks and flights to ferry the paratroopers to their forward fighting holes.

A convoy that left around midday Tuesday arrived at brigade headquarters Thursday — minus one ammo truck.

The truck caught fire and exploded Tuesday in a series of blasts that looked like a Roman candle. The night turned a vivid orange, filled with blasts and the whistle of exploding metal.

No one was injured, but the 26-ton truck was destroyed along with

its cargo of artillery and mortar shells, anti-tank weapons, 50-caliber machine gun rounds and illumination flares.

There were reports that a driver in a white Nissan pickup truck had been shadowing the convoy and sped off just before the fire, but officials said there was no direct proof of terrorism. The fire was still under investigation.

"We have nothing to support it was any type of ambush. As far as we know, it was accidental," said Maj. Baxter Ennis, the 82nd's public affairs officer.

The civilian highway was blocked for an hour while an ordnance team checked the roadway and surrounding area for any unexploded shells or mines.

In a Pentagon briefing Thursday, the number of U.S. forces now in the gulf was put at 473,000.

Iraq has been parading its POWs in an apparent effort to boost morale at home. On Thursday Baghdad radio broadcast interviews with men it described as two captured American and one captured Italian prisoner.

Poor broadcast reception made their statements, monitored in Cyprus, largely inaudible, but the Americans identified themselves as Col. David William Eberly and Lt. Lawrence Randolph Blake, 26, a carrier pilot. The interviewer quoted Eberly as saying "my pilots are expressing their opposition to this war."

Burley, with 8,702 residents, is the area's second-biggest city, followed by Jerome with 6,529 people, Rupert with 5,455, Hailey with 5,687, Buhl with 3,516, Gooding with 2,820, Heyburn with 2,714, Ketchum with 2,523 and Kimberly with 2,367.

Although Twin Falls officials assure their city has even more residents from the state because of the staff nor the money to challenge the Census Bureau's numbers.

"We don't agree with the figures, but we're not in a position to protest, either," said City Manager Tom Courtney. "We have no other data to challenge the figures. We don't know how many surveys might have been returned at all, or weren't returned because people didn't understand the questions."

Courtney said he is concerned Twin Falls might lose sales tax revenue from the state because of the population figures, but he has not calculated how much money is at stake.

"We will lose funding because the rate of growth in other cities has been more rapid than in Twin Falls," he said. "We have a lower percentage of growth than 10 years ago."

## Marine's destination changed

NEW YORK (AP) — Five months ago in the path of a flag-waving Marine boarding a transport ship became an international symbol of American readiness for war with Iraq.

But a funny thing happened. To Bill Sherwin on the way to the Persian Gulf. He wound up in Liberia.

"He never actually made it to the gulf," his mother Barbara said Thursday from the family's home in Chester, N.Y. "After he shipped out he changed ships in the Atlantic and went to protect the embassy in Liberia."

On Aug. 7, The Associated Press distributed a photo of Sherwin, who was based in Camp Lejeune, N.C., boarding the troop ship *Mohebbi*. In one hand he held a machine gun in the other two small flags — the Stars and Stripes and the tricolor of the Irish Republic.

The photo appeared on the cover of the Economist magazine and on the front pages of newspapers in Paris, Dublin, New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Philadelphia and Baltimore. Sherwin was ordered to head for West Africa, where he and other Marines had to duck the crossfire of rival factions.

Meanwhile, the photo of his departure had made him a celebrity in absentia.

Each day the mailbox outside the Sherwin family home northwest of New York City was stuffed with clips and notes sent by family, friends and strangers. They earned about relatives they didn't know they had, including the chairman of the Fianna Fail party in Ireland.

# Saudi pilot shoots down 2 Iraqi jets with missiles

DHAHRAN, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Two F-15 fighter jets loaded with bombs and Exocet anti-ship missiles were streaking low, heading south along the Saudi Arabian coast when Capt. Ayedh swung his F-15 fighter in from behind.

Minutes later the two French-made fighters were destroyed and the first Iraqi air attack in the week-old war was over.

"I just rolled in behind them and shot them down," said the pilot, who asked that his last name not be used. "It was easy."

The Iraqis did not fire back at the Saudi fighters — British authorities said one of the panicked Iraqi pilots fired an Exocet before his plane was destroyed. They said the Exocet was well out of range of coalition force ships in the Persian Gulf and splashed harmlessly into the sea.

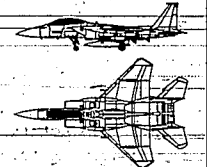
"It's hard to kill someone; but if he becomes an enemy, he deserves it," said the 30-year-old pilot a few hours after the nighttime dogfight.

The Saudi pilot was on a routine patrol of the Saudi-Kuwait border area with three other Saudi jets when an AWACS radar plane picked up the Iraqis and alerted the Saudi patrol, then 80 miles away from the Iraqis.

The Saudis closed to within 3,000 feet of the Iraqi jets before Ayedh fired. He would not say what type of missile he fired but pilots typically

use heat-seeking Sidewinder missiles at that range.

"They started breaking away in front of me but it was too late," said Ayedh. "You know the F-15, nobody can beat it."

The brief skirmish marked a series of firsts in the war: the first Iraqi air-

tack, the first air-to-air kill by a Saudi pilot and the first double kill by any coalition flier.

"Every pilot I am sure is eager to shoot down an airplane," said Ayedh. "It was my day."

The two kills blunted criticism of Saudi efforts in the war. Some U.S. and British troops near the Kuwait border have grumbled about the sudden withdrawal of Saudi ground forces after the war began.

The Saudis have flown more than 1,000 of the 15,000 air sorties in the coalition's air war against Iraq. Their two kills bring to 21 the number of Iraqi planes shot down in combat. At least another 22 Iraqi planes have been destroyed on the ground.

Earlier Thursday, Saudi naval units attacked and destroyed an Iraqi minisubmarine in the gulf.

Ayedh, a short, slight pilot who has flown F-15s for seven years, said he and his fellow Saudi fliers are eager for more combat with the reluctant Iraqis, who generally have kept back from combat.

"They will be shot down," he said of the Iraqis. "They don't know their capability and they don't know our capability."

But everyone expects the Iraqis to step up the air war with attacks on coalition positions. That was the message from Ayedh's superiors when he landed.

"They say 'Good job, but be careful. We are expecting more attacks,'" he said.

## Saudis say missing CBS crew headed for Kuwait

DHAHRAN, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Veteran CBS correspondent Bob Simon and three CBS colleagues covering the Persian Gulf war were reported missing, and Saudi authorities said Friday the crew apparently headed into occupied Kuwait.

The four have been missing since Monday, CBS spokesman Tom Goodman said in New York. He said a Saudi military patrol found their

road in a remote area of northern Saudi Arabia.

He identified those missing besides Simon as producer Peter Bluff,

cameraman Roberto Alvarez, and soundman Juan Caldera.

Goodman said CBS was hoping the crew was with friendly forces in the area, "but we simply do not know at this time and we have no new information."

# White House tightens security for war

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush's Secret Service agents now routinely tote gas masks.

Dozens of riot-helmeted guards stand sentry along the White House fence. Sharpshooters prowl the roof.

A line of police vehicles is stationed in the median strip of Pennsylvania Ave. Sometimes, when protests get unruly, traffic in front of the nation's most famous address is stopped entirely.

And that's just what you can see. Officials understandably talk about what you can't. But you can bet there's plenty of hidden firepower there.

"The president lives next to public streets, in a metropolitan area," said Chuck Vance, a former Secret Service agent and now a consultant on security. "The president does not have to hide out in a bunker 60 feet in the ground. You do the best you can and you use whatever resources are available to you."

To state the obvious, security surrounding the president and the executive mansion has been stepped up dramatically since the Persian Gulf war began a week ago.

One of the first tells of the new heightened security was the cancelling of public tours of the White House for the first time since World War II.

Officials decided that the tours provided would be terrorists too easy access to the mansion, even though visitors had been required to pass through metal detectors and have bags searched. Some 3,500 visitors a day — more than a million a year — had been taking the tours.

When there is an alert — a protester threatening to jump the relatively low fence around the White House perimeter, or perhaps, a squirrel setting off electronic motion alarms — even tighter security is imposed.

For instance, doors are locked to the press room — preventing anyone from either leaving

or entering — until the alarm is called off.

After reporters were locked into the White House for about ten minutes on Monday, the all-clear was sounded and the doors opened. Agents would not say what had set off the alarms, but said that no one had been arrested and that there had been no intrusion on the White House grounds.

Gas masks are now routinely carried by agents who work at the White House. An agent was even stationed near the Oval Office on the night when President Bush addressed the nation, with a mask in a military bag, presumably for the president if needed.

Agents were also seen carrying gas masks aboard their helicopter last weekend as Bush headed for Camp David.

Bob Snow, a spokesman for the Secret Service, said the gas masks may be "made more evident now by people carrying them around" in the recent state of alert, but that their use by the Secret Service goes back to the Johnson years.

## Thursday's events in the gulf

Here is a look at the latest developments in the Persian Gulf war:

Kuwait's news agency claimed that allied forces drove Iraqi troops from a Kuwaiti island, but a U.S. military spokesman refused to confirm that the island was captured. The spokesman, Air Force Col. Phil Lacombe, said Thursday that 51 Iraqis were taken prisoner and three were killed in the battle with U.S. Navy forces against two Iraqi ships and an Iraqi force on a small island of Qurah. If the report from the Kuwaiti agency KUNA proves true, it was the first piece of emirate territory reported freed from Iraqi occupation.

An American pilot was saved in a dramatic rescue after his jet was disabled by ground fire and he ejected over the Persian Gulf. U.S. Army Col. Greg Peppin said the pilot's F-16 was hit by enemy fire over Kuwait on Wednesday. He said the airman ejected over the gulf, leaving the aircraft to crash into the water. A helicopter picked him up and took him to the USS Nicholas. "Our last report is that the pilot is in good condition," Peppin said Thursday.

A total of 19 Iraqi planes were reported shot down in combat and another 22 destroyed on the ground. Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams explained at a Washington briefing why the tally of 19 Iraqi aircraft reported shot down was the same as the total reported 24 hours earlier. He said the allies discovered they double counted earlier.

Air raid sirens sounded in Israel Thursday night, but the warning was canceled three minutes later, indicating a false alarm. There was no immediate explanation from the army command. The sirens went off at 10:32 p.m. (3:32 p.m. EST), and Israel radio had reported the alarm followed a missile attack and the warning applied to the entire country.

Allied forces captured an Iraqi minesweeper, British military officials said. Group Capt. Naill Irving of the Royal Air Force said three Iraqis were killed and 22 captured in the operation in the northern Persian Gulf. He also said a sixth British Tornado was lost.

The number of allied sorties passed 15,000 on Thursday. Allied sources in Dhahran said the U.S.-led coalition wants to pick up the pace, perhaps flying 3,000 missions a day if the skies remain clear. The coalition bombers were targeting Iraq's elite Republican Guards.

The strategic Iraqi city of Basra was under allied bombardment from land and sea, said Iran's official news agency. It said said-bombs from allied warplanes and missiles fired by U.S. warships repeatedly struck the southern port city, the site of Iraq's military headquarters for the Kuwait theater. It was the third straight day of reported bombing on Basra, which lies near the Iranian frontier.

In Amman, Jordan, a fundamentalist Muslim leader was arrested after suggesting that King Hussein should be overthrown if he does not join the war on Iraq's side. Police detained Atta Abu-Rushteh, the spokesman of the Liberation Party, immediately after a news conference Thursday during which he made the threat.

### Washington

The FBI identified elements of international terrorist groups in the United States, but the FBI chief said Americans should go about their business as usual. FBI Director William S. Sessions stressed Thursday that the threat of international attacks in this country was low despite the outbreak of war in the Persian Gulf. The FBI said supporters of terrorist groups present in the United States included the Abu Nidal organization, Hezbollah, the Palestinian Liberation Front, and the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine.

Congress unanimously approved a bill providing tax relief for U.S. troops serving in the Persian Gulf. The measure now goes to President Bush for his signature. The bill would allow military personnel serving in the combat zone to delay filing their 1990 tax returns until they have been out of the zone for six months. There would be no penalty or interest charge for the delay.

### Elsewhere

Germany ordered the expulsion of 28 Iraqi diplomats employed at the Iraqi Embassy in Bonn and at Iraq's mission in Berlin, the Foreign Ministry said. Further details on Thursday's expulsion were not immediately available.

### Financial

The stock market staged a broad advance. The Dow Jones industrial average closed up 24 at 2,643 Thursday. Interest rates declined in the government bond market. The dollar was down and gold prices also were lower. Dealers said news from the Persian Gulf was having less of an effect on the dollar and that the market had returned to a more fundamental view of world currencies.

# Subs launch missiles in combat for 1st time

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. submarines, operating from the depths of the Mediterranean and Red seas, are firing Tomahawk cruise missiles at targets inside Iraq, Pentagon sources said Thursday.

The development in the war against Saddam Hussein amounts to "the first use of American submarine-launched missiles in a combat environment," one source said.

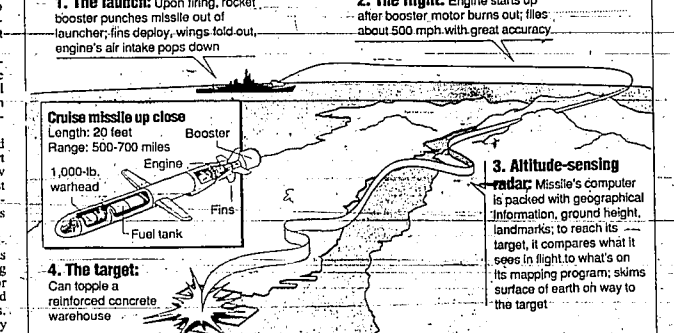
"There have been multiple launches" of Tomahawk cruise missiles from submerged subs over the last several days, said a second source. Both spoke on the condition of anonymity.

The entry of submarine-launched missiles into Operation Desert Storm "just gives Saddam a new threat to worry about," the first source said. Missiles "are now coming at him from the north as well as the south."

Releasing cruise missiles from either the Red or Mediterranean seas means the weapons could be flying through Turkish, Egyptian, Israeli or Syrian airspace. The sources would not describe the Tomahawks' routes. Normally, a high state of secrecy surrounds submarine activities, as shown by the comment of one top Pentagon general when asked earlier this week about the role of submarines in the Persian Gulf war.

## Tomahawk missile: A computer is the pilot

The Tomahawk missile is essentially an aircraft with a computer for a pilot. It can be launched from the ground, air and sea. This weapon is small, but potent. How it works:

"Let's just say a few," one source said.

"There are 123 submarines in the Navy's fleet of 89 attack subs and 34 ballistic missile submarines."

"Submariners are dubbed the 'Silent Service' because of their ability to roam undetected and hunt their prey at will. They prefer to have their activities kept out of the limelight.

Their effectiveness depends on them being the big question mark," said one Pentagon official.

Much fanfare usually accompanies the activities of surface craft, such as battleships, meaning an opponent can prepare for their entry into combat.

But submarines stay out of sight, deliver their weapons and leave without detection. "A lack of fanfare is a measure of submariners' success," the official said. "The only time anyone would know it is there is when the Tomahawk breaks the water."

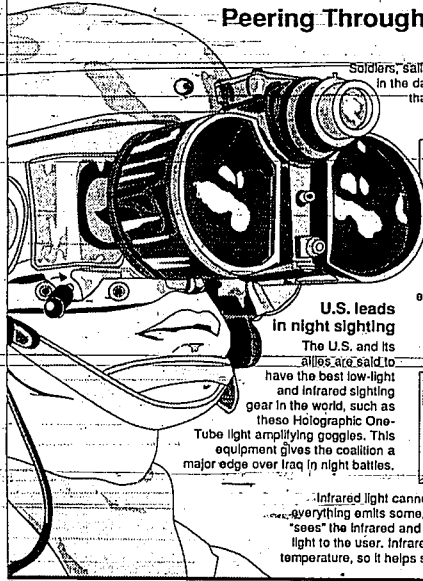
After launch, a solid-propellant booster shoots the missile into the sky. Then a small turbofan engine takes over and the missile cruises to its target.

Making use of the pinpoint accuracy of the relatively slow-flying, computerized Tomahawks, the subs have been directing the missiles against strategic targets, such as suspected chemical weapons facilities, the sources said. With a conventional warhead, the missiles have a range of about 700 miles.

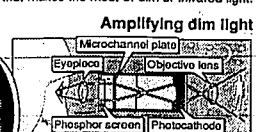
The missiles, introduced into the submarine fleet in 1988, were launched from battleships in the Persian Gulf the first night of the war.

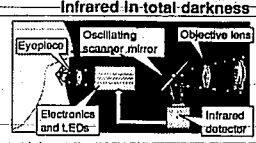
## Peering Through the Blackness of a Battlefield at Night

# Army calls up more reservists

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army has called to active duty 4,478 more reservists and National Guard members to support Operation Desert Storm, the Pentagon said Thursday.

The Pentagon said the designated units from 22 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia, will be on active duty effective Friday.

It did not give a breakdown of how many are being activated from each unit.

Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney at the same time authorized the Army to call up 220,000 reservists up from 115,000 under previous ceilings. The Navy, Air Force and Marines were authorized to double the number of their reserves called to active duty, to a total of 140,000.

The length of service was also extended from 180 days to one year.

# Cavalry still has dangerous job, threatened by feelings of terror

**EDITOR'S NOTE** — This report was drawn from a pool dispatch and was subject to a security review by the U.S. military.

**IN SAUDI ARABIA (AP)** — The Army helicopter pilots gathered in a tent to talk about the difference between fear and terror and prepare their minds for war.

Fear was to be expected, the experienced pilots said. But terror could cripple a soldier and make a perilous job worse.

"They've got apprehensions and concerns, and we talk about it all the time," said Capt. Mike Kapiak, commander of a helicopter troop in the 1st Cavalry Squadron of the Army's 1st Armored Division.

The cavalry squadron is a helicopter and ground unit whose mission is to seek out the enemy, then direct heavier forces in for the kill. History has shown the job to be among the most dangerous in the Army.

The airborne scouts ride in OH-58 Observation-helicopters with Cobra AH-1 attack helicopters as escorts. The ground unit uses Bradley armored fighting vehicles.

The OH-58s do not carry a single

gun and their pilots' motto is "Unarmed and Unafraid."

"If your front-seater is in real terror, that's when you've got to make the decision," said Warrant Officer Donald J. Hunter, 20, a Cobra attack helicopter pilot. "You've got to decide whether to drop back and hope that he'll recover, or push on and hope it makes him braver next time."

The discussion in a dirt-floored tent on a rainy day came as the allies relentlessly bombed Iraq in the air attack that started last Thursday. A bloody-ground attack is expected next, and troops in the cavalry unit worked to prepare their minds, bodies and machines.

"They tell us that terror could happen, and that it probably will happen," said Hunter, the youngest pilot in the group. He said the fiercest moment at risk would be the gunner in the nose. "Like they say, if the blood could splash up, it would hit you in the front seat," he said.

The 1st Squadron, 1st Cavalry Regiment, is the most decorated in the Army. It has a horseback history dating to 1833 and combat decora-

tions in the Indian Wars, the Civil War, World War II and more than half a dozen battles in Vietnam.

The cavalry is tightly armed in comparison with the Iraqi armor it would hope to find. "In peacetime this is one of the best jobs we have in the Army," said 2nd Lt. David DeSantos of Buffalo, a platoon leader in a Bradley troop. "But when the bullets start flying..." The 25-year-old's voice trailed off.

The members of the unit use black pens to write their blood type on a handout on the outside of their helmets, a step intended to save a medic the precious seconds otherwise needed to consult the dog tag.

The lightly armored vehicle used to pick-up the dead and wounded on the battlefield has been christened the "meat wagon" by the medics.

An unofficial unit patch designed by members of the helicopter troop depicts a burning chopper and says: "Red Cavalry is highly armed."

"There is an air everywhere I go that has a lot of sobriety to it," said a worn and haggard Lt. Col. Bill Reese, the 40-year-old squadron commander. "This is a very sobering situation."

# Saddam's family is in Zambia, says London newspaper report

LONDON (AP) — A London newspaper Thursday quoted diplomatic sources as saying that Iraq President Saddam Hussein's family has flown to Zambia and is staying in a house owned by the Zambian president.

A spokeswoman for the Zambian government denied the report.

It was the latest in a series of reports — in German, Egyptian and Swiss newspapers, among others, about the whereabouts of Saddam's family since Iraq invaded Kuwait on Aug. 2.

Daily Telegraph quoted unidentified diplomatic sources as saying Saddam's wife, Sajida, and his family fled Baghdad shortly after the first allied air attack last

week on the Iraqi capital, Baghdad.

It said an Air Mauritania flight took them to Nouakchott, the capital of the Islamic state of Mauritania, a former French colony in the Sahara. Then they flew on an Air Zambia plane to Lusaka.

They are now staying in a well-guarded house in northeast Zambia belonging to President Kenneth Kaunda, said the newspaper, which said Zambia has received large amounts of aid from Iraq.

Zambian officials have denied that Saddam's family is in the southern African country. Lusaka's State House spokeswoman Mable Milimo called the report a "rumor that had been spread by some journalists in Lusaka."

# Training missions sends carrier to sea

MAYPORT, Fla. (AP) — The USS Forrestal sailed out of Mayport Naval Station on Thursday for what officials claim is a short training mission off the coast of Florida.

The crew knew their orders specified a training session, but they didn't know if the assignment would stop there.

"Our families are caught in the middle," said Capt. Bob Cole, the ship's commanding officer. "I think you'll see our people get an extra leg in case we don't come back. We are leaving on a routine training mission and if we are ordered to deploy, we can do that."

**Bush, Soviet official to discuss summit**

WASHINGTON — Soviet Foreign Minister Alexander Bessmertnykh is expected to meet this weekend with President Bush and Secretary of State James A. Baker III as the administration nears a decision on whether to postpone next month's summit meeting in Moscow.

Bessmertnykh tentatively planned to arrive in Washington Saturday afternoon and stay through Monday, U.S. officials said. The talks are certain to dwell on the Soviet crackdowns in Lithuania and Latvia as well as arms-control issues and the Persian Gulf war.

Other officials told The Associated Press the administration wants to discuss its concerns that the Soviets may be shifting tanks to east of the Ural Mountains rather than destroy the weapons under another arms control treaty signed in November.

**AIDS deaths top 100,000 mark in U.S.**

ATLANTA — The death toll from AIDS in the United States has topped 100,000, with nearly a third dying just last year, and is escalating, federal health officials said Thursday.

Out of 161,073 AIDS cases reported in this country since June 1981, 100,777 people had died as of the end of December, the Centers for Disease Control said, citing new statistics.

CDC researchers project that, in the next three years, as many as 215,000 more Americans will die of AIDS. "The epidemic is here," said Dr. Ruth Berkelman, chief of the CDC's AIDS Surveillance Branch. "We see from these numbers alone that AIDS has already taken an incredibly heavy toll, and there's no letup in sight."

**Child-support problem hit with posters**

JACKSON, Miss. — Posters of the "10 Most Wanted" parents behind in their child-support payments will be going up in public buildings and published in newspapers around Mississippi within two weeks.

"We're kind of excited about that. We expect dads to come forward, because they don't want their names and faces on the list," state Department of Human Services Executive Director Bea Branch said Wednesday. "I say 'dads' because 95 percent of the people we're after are fathers."

Parents the department has been unable to locate were nominated for the list, which will feature those owing the largest amounts of child support, said James Graves, head of the department's child-support enforcement division.

**Book thief said he would plead insane**

DES MOINES, Iowa — Stephen Blumberg took thousands of rare books from libraries across the country under a delusion he was the "protector of some bygone era," an attorney at his trial said.

Blumberg, 42, pleaded innocent by reason of insanity. At his federal court trial Thursday, the man who turned him in to the FBI for a reward last year said Blumberg bragged about his ability to steal rare books and said he would pretend to be insane if he was caught.

**Risk of breast cancer jumps to 1 woman in 9**

NEW YORK (AP) — The average American woman runs a one-in-nine risk of developing breast cancer during her lifetime, an increase over the previous estimate, the American Cancer Society said Thursday.

The increase reflects rising breast cancer rates and the fact that women are living longer, the society said. About 175,000 American women will get breast cancer this year, and 44,500 women will die from the disease, the society said in releasing its annual projections.

"Every American woman should consider herself at risk," Dr. Clark Heath, the society's vice president for epidemiology and statistics, said in a statement.

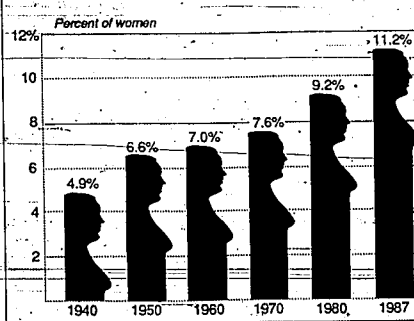
The society had projected a 1-in-10 risk since 1987, based on data from the early 1980s. The new estimate is based on federal figures for 1987, the latest available, said cancer society statistician Catherine Boring.

Edward Sondik, the National Cancer Institute's deputy director of the division of cancer prevention and control, noted that the change means going from a risk of 10 percent to one of 11 percent.

"The difference is 'not that great,' he said, but 'the bottom line is that there's no question that it's going up.'"

Boring said one reason for the in-

crease is a rise in reported breast cancer rates, which has not been well understood.

Part of it seems to reflect increases in numbers of women getting mammograms, so that more cancers are being caught at early stages, she said.

Other possible explanations include changes in diet, which is being investigated as a possible contributor to breast cancer, and increases in women who delay childbearing, she said. Women who have not produced a live birth before age 30 face an increased breast cancer risk.

**Anti-cancer drug found in habitat of spotted owl**

GRANTS PASS, Ore. (AP) — The battle against cancer is about to collide with the drive to protect the habitat of the northern spotted owl, the focus of a dispute over use of the Northwest's oldest forests.

The National Cancer Institute wants 720,000 pounds of bark harvested from the Pacific yew this year to produce 55 pounds of a compound called taxol for intensive clinical testing as an anti-cancer drug.

But harvesting that much bark would mean intrusions into forests set aside as sanctuaries for the northern spotted owl, which was listed as a threatened species last year. Closing those forests has undercut the Northwest's powerful timber industry.

Taxol has shown promise against ovarian cancer, which claims 12,000 victims a year. It also is being tested against breast, lung and colon cancers, said Saul Scheperitz, a biochemist in the National Cancer Institute's therapeutics development program.

### Changes in federal highway support could harm Idaho

Although Idaho has about two-tenths of 1 percent of the automobiles in the nation, a substantial amount of the nation's goods travel over Idaho's roads. Not only is it fair that the state gets more federal highway money than it pays out, it's a practical necessity.

That may change, and the Idaho Transportation Department may have something to do with that.

State officials have joined an unusual coalition with urban states in a debate over the way states get federal highway money.

It could mean that in future years Idaho will only get as many dollars from Washington as it is willing to spend.

The debate is over reauthorization of the \$16 billion Surface Transportation Act that paid in part for the interstate highway system. The law, funded primarily by money from federal gasoline tax revenues, expires Oct. 1.

Under existing law, states provide 10 percent of the money for inter-state projects and 20 percent for other road construction or improvements. The federal government pays the rest.

A group of populous states that insists it gives more money to the federal government in taxes than it gets back in road repair money wants to establish a new formula: one federal dollar for each state dollar spent.

Such a change would hurt states like Idaho, which get slightly more back for their dollars.

Nonetheless, Idaho has joined the coalition in pressing for changes in the act that would give states flexibility as to how federal

money is spent, something that doesn't exist in the current law. Idaho officials say they joined the coalition because it is better to work with large states that want changes in the funding formula than to try to fight their powerful congressional delegations.

They also say states such as Texas and California have large rural areas much like Idaho and other Western states, and so understand the state's transportation problems.

The Surface Transportation Act, an Eisenhower-era law that was designed to get the interstate highway system built as quickly as possible, is unnecessarily rigid. If money is allocated to add a lane to an interstate highway, for example, it has to be used for that purpose, even if the overpasses under which that lane runs are falling down.

But the dollar-for-dollar funding formula that the reformers advocate would mean, quite simply, that states like Idaho would have less to spend on roads.

The Bush administration has continued the Reagan policy of placing more of the financial burden for highway projects on local governments.

While more populated states can make up the difference by raising various taxes, rural state taxpayers are already tapped out.

That's certainly the case in Idaho, which is already facing a \$7 billion bill for highway, road and bridge reconstruction.

Idahoans are willing to pay their fair share, they shouldn't have to pay for rebuilding highways worn out by trucks hauling Canadian lumber from Washington mills to Midwest markets.

## Patriot missile defense MVP in gulf

The Most Valuable Defensive Player Award in the Persian Gulf War will go to the American-made Patriot missile.

Already, this high-technology, anti-ballistic missile has shown a high degree of success in intercepting a sizable number of incoming Iraqi Scud ballistic missiles. But why have most of us never heard of the mysterious Patriot? What is this missile? Where did it come from?

The Patriot has never been used in combat before; thus Israel's scramble to deploy it and America's uncertainty, until now, of its effectiveness.

In short, the Patriot is the most advanced operational ABM missile in the Western world.

An ABM missile is designed, as one might expect, to intercept and destroy incoming ballistic missiles. Ballistic missiles are pilotless vehicles (with high-explosive, chemical, biological or nuclear warheads) propelled by rocket engines to a point, after which their trajectory becomes a free fall.

While the Soviet Union has six advanced operational ABM missiles (namely, the SA-N-4, SA-5, SA-8, SA-10, SA-12 and ABM-1B, the last of which is laser-guided), the West has only recently developed the Patriot.

The Patriot was tested, for the first time, in September 1986.

Flying at a speed of Mach 3 (or three times the speed of sound), a Patriot missile intercepted an incoming Lance tactical missile at an altitude of 26,000 feet; the Patriot missile traveled eight miles to the point of interception. The Lance was obliterated.

What more do we know about the Patriot? It is officially called the MIM-104; measures 5-foot-4, weighs 1,997 pounds and finds its ballistic missile target by a combination of radar homing and pre-programmed command guidance systems.

Also, Patriot has two siblings: an ABM missile called the SRHIT, first tested in what defense experts have dubbed the "Homing Overlay Experiment," and another ABM missile called HEDI, yet untested. Both SRHIT and HEDI are still in development.

Nevertheless, the SRHIT, or Small Radar Homing Intercept Technology, has successfully destroyed a ballistic missile in space, at the mid-point of the ballistic missile's trajectory.

In 1984, a SRHIT missile, launched from the South Pacific, destroyed a dummy nuclear warhead fired from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California, some 3,000 miles away. By contrast, the Patriot can only destroy a missile after it has re-entered the atmosphere and is closing in on its target.

Meanwhile, HEDI, which stands for High Endoatmospheric Defense Interceptor, is expected to employ a heat-seeking sensor to destroy ballistic missiles just at the point of atmospheric re-entry (or roughly halfway between the intercept points of Patriot or SRHIT).

Does all this sound a bit like S.D.I., former President Reagan's much-derided Strategic Defense Initiative, otherwise known as Star Wars? It should, because

these technologies — Patriot, SRHIT and HEDI — are all the direct result of private contracts signed as a consequence of his March 1983 plea for long-term research and development of effective anti-ballistic missile defenses.

Also to Reagan's immediate credit are the strategic modernization program of the 1980s and the so-called black programs, including our highly-effective F-117A Stealth Fighter.

While the total cost of the Patriot and Stealth Fighter is not available, the research and development cost of SRHIT, by LTV Aerospace and Defense, will be \$70 million; the cost of HEDI, by McDonnell Douglas Astronautics, will be \$332 million.

Was Reagan right? Is strategic defense worth the money we have put into it? Maybe not: Maybe his determined spending on strategic defense will prove to have been wasteful, hopelessly idealistic and, on balance, a net loss.

Still, as the war clouds on, there are those in Saudi Arabia and Israel who, with ballistic missiles raining down on them, will firmly disagree: Patriot, they will say, is the hands-down favorite for defensive MVP in this conflict.

And perhaps, one day, there will be others of us who, facing weapons more devastating than conventionally armed Scuds, will give thanks for the existence of such advanced, defensive systems as SRHIT and HEDI.

**Officials to challenge Amtrak**

BOISE (AP) — Dismayed Idaho officials are planning to challenge Amtrak's decision to drop train service to Boise.

A spokesman for Gov. Cecil Andrus said the governor is "dissatisfied, and furthermore, he doesn't accept it and is insisting on a response from Amtrak."

And Sen. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, is "going to want to see what kind of rationale they have and to take a look at our options," a spokesman said.

Idaho officials were surprised Wednesday when they learned W. Graham Claytor Jr., chairman of National Railroad Passenger Corp., which runs Amtrak, had decided to cut direct Boise service as soon as April 7.

Requiring Boise passengers to pick up the Pioneer train at Nampa will enable passengers in Seattle to leave one hour later, Amtrak officials say.

**Andrus wants another draft of document**

BOISE (AP) — Gov. Cecil Andrus has joined Govs. Stan Stephens of Montana and Mike Sullivan of Wyoming in calling for federal officials to redraft their "Vision for the Future" plan for the Yellowstone ecosystem.

The governors asked Wednesday for revisions of the draft plan to clarify how a coordinated management system for the Yellowstone area would take into account the states' management responsibilities in and around Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks.

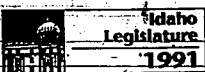
The Vision document was prepared by the U.S. Forest Service and National Park Service through the interagency Greater Yellowstone Coordinating Committee. It is a vague framework for managing 11.7 million acres of federal land in the Yellowstone area.

The agencies contend the report aims to balance environmental protection against economic development, but critics say it would lock up millions of acres to multiple use and development.

The governors said the language in the Vision document also could be interpreted as calling for expansion of Yellowstone National Park boundaries and a restriction of traditional uses of adjacent, mostly state-owned lands.

**Zinser acknowledges tougher economic times**

BOISE (AP) — As the Legislature's conservative estimate of Idaho's financial future began making its way through the House Thursday, University of Idaho President Elizabeth Zinser told budget writers she recognizes state resources for higher education will be limited.



"We see a period of diminishing resources," Zinser told budget writers. "But the urgency of higher education issues remain before us. There remains a long agenda because there are unfulfilled

promises — promises that we must address with some urgency." In outlining the school's budget request for the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee, she said Idaho should weather the recession engulfing much of the nation, but not without feeling some impact. And that will translate into

slower expansion of financial support for the university system, Zinser said.

In response, the university has been reallocating existing resources and aggressively seeking other sources of revenue, she said.

In the last three years, there has been a 15 percent reduction in programs offered from the Moscow campus, she said, and the state's generous aid packages in recent years have helped attract millions of dollars in federal grants and from private sources.

"We have a successful track record, but again we're not satisfied," Zinser said. "There's more to be done there."

But with recession as a backdrop, she told the committee that redirecting existing resources to increase efficiency, "and new investments from you, go hand in hand."

"If Idaho fares better than most states, we have an opportunity to go beyond simply maintaining our relative position to assume a stronger competitive position."

### 2 Twin Falls men face child molesting charges

TWIN FALLS — Two local men were arraigned in magistrate court this week on separate counts of lewd conduct with a minor under the age of 16.

Ciaran P. Murphy, 34, 1839 Skyline Dr., faces four counts of molesting a 12-year-old girl.

Murphy was interviewed by Twin Falls police detective Ronald Roberson on Jan. 22, when he admitted "touching, fondling and soliciting sexual favors" from the girl, according to court papers.

He was arrested a week later after the girl was interviewed by police. He has been released "on his own recognition and ordered not to see the girl."

David A. Leon, 38, 483 Fillmore St., has been charged with one count of lewd conduct with a 12-year-old girl.

Interviewed by Roberson Jan. 18, Leon admitted fondling the girl on Dec. 5, 1990, court papers say.

Preliminary hearings for both men are scheduled for Feb. 8. The maximum sentence for lewd and lascivious conduct with a child under 16 is life in prison.

### Use 'Desert Fax' and send letters to servicemen in gulf for free

BOISE — For messages that can't wait for the U.S. Postal Service to get to troops in Saudi Arabia, you can fax them — for free.

It's part of a promotional "Desert Fax" service, sponsored by AT&T.

Twin Falls Rep. Ron Black, whose son is serving in the Persian Gulf, is collecting fax messages from the Magic Valley and bringing them to the AT&T Phone Center at Boise Towne Square, which sends the faxes across the world for free.

Once the faxes arrive in Saudi Arabia, they are distributed by military mail.

Black, who returns home from the Legislature on weekends, collects the local faxes from the "Gulf Post" booth set up at the Blue Lakes Shopping Center.

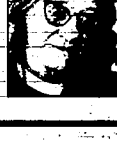

## Child abuse worse

BOISE — The results are in, but the findings are incomplete. In a newly released study for the Legislature, Jack McMahon, Idaho's chief deputy attorney general, found that one in six child sexual abusers in Idaho has more than one victim.

"It's a much bigger problem. We've only touched the tip of the iceberg," said McMahon. McMahon's study attracted the attention of the governor and the Legislature, where legislation is pending that would slap a five-year mandatory minimum sentence on repeat child sexual abusers who have prior convictions.

McMahon mentioned that his findings, derived from comments in judicial disposition reports, probation-violation data and multiple filings naming multiple victims, are low.

"The only information we got was buried into it accidentally," he said. The most accurate information would be gleaned from routine presentence investigation reports, which are closed records, he said.

McMahon said he can't extrapolate from the data and determine the precise number of repeat offenders.

"We just don't have a clue, but we suspect it's much higher," he said.

The annual report, which analyzed all child sexual abuse cases disposed of in Idaho courts between July 1989 and June 1990, identified 35 repeat offenders. Sixteen had prior convictions for child sexual abuse, four had been charged previously or admitted to prior abuse, 12 had multiple victims when apprehended and three violated probation during the study year by again sexually abusing a child.

Some of those with prior convictions had as many as six or seven.

"Those are the people we have to nail," said Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Deerlodge, who is co-sponsoring the five-year mandatory minimum sentencing bill.

Although the total number of repeat offenders may not be high, he said, victims have to be protected.

"We need to pay attention to the innocent people who are harmed," Darrington said.

The report also examined sentences for repeat offenders and found they were treated more severely than the overall group that was studied. Almost two-thirds spent hard time in prison, compared to 40 percent for all the child sexual abusers that were studied.

Their average sentence was six years, about nine months longer than the general average.

"In my experience, which is extensive, repeat offenders

## It's a bird; it's a plane...no, it's a giant tater chip

POCATELLO — The world's largest potato "chip" will come to Idaho soon and go on permanent display at a potato education center near Blackfoot.

"I've never seen it and I don't know the exact measurements, but it's huge," said Rex Call, a member of the Idaho World Potato Exposition board of directors.

The potato center will open in May alongside Interstate 15 to what sponsors hope will be a flood of Yellowstone-bound tourists.

The exposition has a nickname — "taters for out-of-staters." It will feature a kitchen offering potato treats and educational displays tracking the progress of the potato from Peru to Ireland to Idaho.

"Our goal is to tell the story of the potato

industry in a very entertaining and first class manner," said Maurine Hill, director of Idaho's World Potato Exposition. Hill was staffing a booth at the Idaho Potato School in Pocatello this week.

The visitors center will be housed in an old railroad station.

The giant "chip" is owned by Proctor and Gamble, the maker of Pringles brand potato snacks. It's not exactly a chip — it's

a thin cake of processed potato.

The 1990 Guinness Book of World Records lists the largest chip at 4 inches wide and 7 inches long, made in 1972 from oversized potatoes. Call said the Guinness staff is still debating over whether to list the Proctor and Gamble chip.

"We don't want to mislead people. We may have to change it if they decide it's the largest man-made potato chip," he said.

## Fire tears through home, but family happy to be alive

TWIN FALLS — Fire ravaged a home at 687 Alturus Dr. Thursday afternoon, but the owners says it could have been worse.

"This couldn't have happened at a better time," a calm Dennis Bohm said Thursday evening. "At least it didn't happen at night while we were all asleep."

Bohm was at work, his wife was gone and his two children were at school when

the fire broke out.

"Only the family dog and cat were home when firefighters arrived to find flames and smoke pouring from the roof of the house at 1:48 p.m."

Both pets escaped unharmed, but "the cat's going to need a psychiatrist," Bohm said.

The dog, Mandy, covered on a woodpile in the back yard, watched as pump-trucks poured water on the one-story wood and brick-house from the front and back.

Police blocked off both ends of the street as the thick smoke reduced visibility to only a few feet.

Ten firefighters battled the blaze for more than three hours, Battalion Chief Jerry Hafer of the Twin Falls fire department said.

When they were finished, only the charred skeleton of the wood shake roof remained perched atop the smoke-blackened brick foundation.

The fire apparently began in the attic,

Hafer said. The tight roof held in the heat and smoke until flames burst through to the flammable wood roof, he said.

Once through the roof, the flames burned quickly, fueled by an icy wet wind.

"That wind makes a difference," Hafer said. "That fire gets in the wind and it really burns."

Firefighters are still investigating the cause of the blaze, but Hafer said high winds fanning flames in the wood stove.

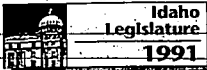

"With our country at war in the Middle East, the recent five-cent federal fuel tax increase and Idaho's economy entering a recession," Hansen said, the governor's proposal "is not the plan. ... Right now, I feel his plan would greatly fuel in-

flation here in the state."

Andrus proposed boosting the state fuel tax by six cents to 24 cents a gallon and doubling vehicle registration fees to generate about \$63 million a year in new revenue. But while Hansen declared his staunch opposition to any user-fee hikes under current conditions, other lawmakers from both parties have indicated support for increases at a lower level than the governor proposed.

Andrus as well as a number of lawmakers have also indicated opposition to using general tax money from the surplus or the reserve to finance highway work. The \$34.5 million reserve was set up as a

hedge against economic downturns and the budget deficits they could create.

Hansen, a third-term lawmaker serving his first session as a committee chairman, was the first official to predict Idaho's economy would slip into recession.

Most experts and analysts have said Idaho's economic expansion will probably slow down over the next 18 months but the state should weather the national recession without serious financial problems.

Once the economy stabilizes, Hansen said he would support a scaled-down version of the Andrus proposal, phased in over three years.

# Investigators are against water rate increase

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The Idaho Water Resource Board's latest irrigation proposal faces rough sailing if the first hearing on the matter is any indication.

The proposal would add a \$1 surcharge on each acre-foot of irrigation water leased from the state's water banks.

More than a dozen eastern Idaho water users, most representing irrigation districts and canal companies,

denounced the proposal Wednesday. They said that in dry years, when they have to lease more water, they would be unable to afford the surcharge.

The amount represents a 36-percent increase over the \$2.75 per acre-foot that Water District 1 charged last year.

Ten years ago, the price was about \$1.25. The district serves about 1.3 mil-

lion irrigated acres in Idaho. The surcharge is earmarked for low-interest loans for development of water projects.

The Idaho Department of Water Resources scheduled additional hearings on the proposal and other changes in how the state water banks are run in Twin Falls on Thursday and Boise on Friday.

Wheat farmers, who have been getting among the lowest prices in a

decade for their crops, would be especially hurt, water users testified.

St. Anthony resident Loren Young, president of the Independent Canal Co., said the small company is experiencing "tremendous" water losses through seepage into the ground.

The company, which irrigates 6,000 acres, requires 10 to 12 acre-foot of water per acre.

# Gem court upholds ruling in medical lawsuit

BOISE (AP) — A doctor must inform a patient of the risks associated with a surgical procedure to the standard used by the local community, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

The court on Thursday voted 4-1 to sustain a jury verdict and later rulings by former Judge H. Reynold George in a Bonneville County case.

The jury found for Dr. Stephen Carter and against a lawsuit filed by Joe and Carol Joy Sherwood.

The Sherwoods alleged that when Carter performed a biopsy of Mrs. Sherwood's lymph nodes, in 1984, he severed a spinal nerve.

The lawsuit also claimed that Carter failed to properly instruct the

patient of the possible risks and consequences of the operation.

The jury found for Carter after medical experts testified they could find no evidence of nerve damage.

George denied motions for judgment notwithstanding the jury ruling and seeking a new trial.

In a decision written by Justice Larry Boyle, the Supreme Court overturned portions of a 1987 ruling and declared that the "informed consent" law requires a physician to advise the patient on the risks involved, to the standard of care practiced by doctors in the local community.

# California water changes could be drastic

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — With California approaching its driest year on record, the state is considering sharp, mandatory curbs of water use in homes and on farms.

The state Water Resources Control Board scheduled a session next week to hear public opinion on 18 proposals, including limiting household use to 300 gallons a day.

Before the drought, daily use per person, not per household, was between 100 and 200 gallons in coastal areas and up to 300 gallons inland, said water officials.

The state board also will consider restricting farmers to only enough water for permanent crops such as orchards, and even then merely for survival, not production.

California is the nation's leading agricultural state, producing more than \$12.6 billion annually — near-

ly double that of the No. 2 state, Texas. The water curbs would have a major impact, especially on seasonal crops that account for more than three-quarters of production.

Crops depending solely on surface water would suffer the most, but many farmers supplement supplies with well water that they could continue to pump.

Another issue before the board, as the state approaches a fifth year of drought, is whether the state should order the operators of large reservoirs to enter into short-term contracts to provide water to cities that have supply shortfalls, even after rationing.

Officials said Wednesday that following the public hearing, rulings could be in place by early February. If it rains and snows enough in the next 60 days, the restrictions could

be eased or removed.

Since the beginning of the rain year, Oct. 1, rainfall has averaged just 28 percent of normal statewide, a state report shows.

Most snow packs hold less than 30 percent of the normal water content. Stream runoff is averaging one-third of normal.

# Utah's Middle East students are low-key

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — In contrast to the raucous anti-American demonstrations on Utah campuses during the Iranian crisis in the 1970s, Middle Eastern students are waiting out the Persian Gulf war with a low profile.

They worry about their families and their own futures in their homelands.

And some fear anti-Arab harassment or, worse, violence from Americans.

Tammy Heiner, an international student specialist at Weber State University, said Middle Eastern students there are "very, very low-key."

"Though no Israelis or Iraqis are enrolled at WSU, there are several Kuwaitis who are concerned about what's happening in their country."

"A lot of our students have not heard from their families since this all began," Heiner said. "They're worried about their families. It's hard for them to concentrate in class or to study."

At the University of Utah, which has the largest population of foreign students in Utah, some Middle Eastern students, particularly Kuwaitis, are trying to go home, said Bill Barnhart, director of the International Center.

"Family concerns have upset them to the point they were seeking financial help to return to Kuwait," Barnhart said. "We advised them not to, but two or

three have tried and couldn't get across the border, so they went to Bahrain to stay with relatives."

As winter quarter began, eight Kuwaitis were enrolled at the U.

"Four were drafted into military duty by their government about a week before the war began."

Barnhart said the four were needed for their linguistics skills and are now in Saudi Arabia.

Only one Iraqi attends the U., but Barnhart hasn't seen her for several months.

There are about a half dozen others who have completed their degrees, but "for obvious reasons are not anxious to go home," he said.

"The general sense I get from the Iraqis I've talked to is they are not typically in favor with their government to begin with," and don't believe it is representative of the people, Barnhart said.

At Utah State University, International Student Services Director Afion Tew also has been busy trying to put several Middle Eastern students at ease.

"I just got off the phone with a Jordanian student and he is very concerned about his family," Tew said. "He wants to go home. I'm trying to encourage him to stay in school."

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Linebackers are like kamikaze pilots, prepared to crash for the cause, willing to give up their bodies — or their helmets — for a noble cause.

The Buffalo Bills and New York Giants have squadrons of them, and continually send crashing through the line.

"Perhaps never has a Super Bowl featured so many star-caliber linebackers — All-Star names like Lawrence Taylor, Pepper Johnson and Carl Banks of the Giants, Darryl Talley, Cornelius Bennett and Shane Conlan of the Bills.

"It's going to be amazing," defensive end Bruce Smith of the Bills said. "I'll probably never see a better group of linebackers assembled on one particular day."

And all of them wearing their helmets, at least at the start. It was not always thus.

In the opening game of the playoffs, the Giants' Johnson plugged the middle of a goal line stand against Chicago. On fourth-and-one, as the Giants stopped Brad Muster, Johnson's helmet went one way and his head went the other.

Linebacker heaven.

"I saw that and I thought 'Yeah!' teammate and fellow linebacker Johnnie Coakles said. Johnson saw it and decided he needed a new chin strap, not a new position.

"I don't know why it popped off," Johnson said, sounding a little bewildered over the episode.

"Then he thought about it and decided he had the answer. 'I shot the light out,' Coach Ray Perkins took a look at him and scrunched that ideal.

"The first day of practice, he said, 'You're a linebacker. You're gonna be the next Lawrence Taylor.'" Bennett said.

## Moscow High grad starts for Giants

MOSCOW (AP) — When the New York Giants take the field Sunday against the Buffalo Bills in Super Bowl XXV, Idaho will be well represented.

Doug Reisenberg, a 1983 Moscow High School graduate, is a three-year starter at right offensive tackle for the Giants.

Reisenberg, a 6-foot 5-inch, 287-pound sixth-round National Football League draft pick in 1987, led the Moscow Bears to the A-2 state championship as a junior.

"The three-time state high school champion in the discus and powerhouse under the boards for Moscow High's basketball team played college football at the University of California at Berkeley. He was a four-year starter for the Golden Bear, three years on defense and one on offense."

Reisenberg's father, Louis, is chairman of the Agricultural Education Department at the University of Idaho, and still lives in Moscow. But the son's accomplishments in the NFL have gone largely unnoticed in his home town.

"I think Doug is maybe the second-best football player ever produced in Idaho, yet he gets almost no recognition," said Eric Bjorkman, Reisenberg's former coach at Moscow High.

"I think a lot of people on the various awards committees overlook kids that are really Idaho kids. The University of Idaho will recruit some kid from Los Angeles Community College and he comes up here and sets four or five school records and is automatically named 'North Idaho Athlete of the Year.' Doug, on the other hand, has not received one single award, or even a nomination. I think that's a crime."

Former Green Bay Packers great Jerry Kramer, who Bjorkman considers the best football player ever to come out of Idaho high school ranks, was a standout at Sandpoint High and the University of Idaho before his NFL fame.

## Lendl beats Edberg on double faults to make Aussie Open final

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — Ivan Lendl gladly took the gift of 12 double faults by Stefan Edberg, including one at match point, and marched into his third straight Australian Open final.

The top-ranked Edberg lived by his serve, and Friday he died by it, falling 6-4, 5-7, 3-6, 7-6 (7-3), 6-4 in the two-time defending champion in just over four hours of center court suspense and blunders.

Edberg gave Lendl the title last year by quitting with a strained stomach muscle in the third set. This time, he gave Lendl a victory by looking on the big points.

The usually unflappable Swede had two chances to put the match away when he served with a 5-4 lead in the fourth set.

Edberg netted a backhand volley to drop the first match point at 6-5, then double-faulted after getting his second match point on a service winner.

Lendl didn't waste the opportunity.

He smacked a forehand return past Edberg for break point, then evened the set when his forehand clipped the top of the net, hopped past Edberg and landed inside the baseline.

In the tiebreaker, Edberg's serve continued.

After Lendl raced to a 6-2 lead,

Edberg saved one set point but gave Lendl another gift by double-faulting again.

Edberg looked demoralized as he came out for the fifth set, and not even the chants from the Swedish fans could help him.

Lendl broke him in the first game with the help of another double-fault to break point.

Edberg rallied briefly, breaking back to 1-1, but was broken again at 15-40 on a backhand volley into the net in the fifth game.

Lendl, who served 12 aces, suddenly came up with a case of serving blues, himself, double-faulting twice while trying to end the match in the 10th game.

But Edberg again netted a backhand volley — then Lendl finished it off with a forehand winner in the corner, far out of the reach of Edberg's backhand.

Lendl ran to the net, pumping both fists over his head, then consoled Edberg with a pat on the back.

## Palmer busy as Senior Skins game nears

KOHALA COAST, Hawaii (AP) — Arnold Palmer sighed, an exhalation composed of resignation, frustration and anticipation.

"I keep saying I'm going to slow down, but it looks like I'm playing a heavy schedule again," Palmer said before a practice round for the Senior Skins Game.

He's been talking about a reduction for more than 25 years, since the height of his Hall of Fame career in the early-to-mid-60s, when he helped take golf into the television era and became the most popular player the game has known.

But the combination of constant clamoring demands for his appearances and Palmer's delight in performing have prohibited any significant reduction in his world-wide schedule.

Last year, for example, he played in 28 competitive events, plus dozens of one-day exhibitions, and appearances and a reduction doesn't appear to be on tap this year, either.

Palmer, 61, and starting his 37th season as a touring pro, will begin three consecutive weeks of competition with the five-man, two-day, 18-hole Senior Skins Game Saturday and Sunday.

He'll follow that with his first appearance since 1980 in the Pebble Beach National Pro-Am and his 33rd consecutive start in the Bob Hope Classic.

His immediate schedule also includes a Senior PGA Tour event on a trip to Tokyo in March, the Masters and the Senior PGA championship.

## Hull 2 away from 50-50 club

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Brett Hull needs two goals in the next two games to join the 50-50 club, and his St. Louis Blues teammates are ready to help.

"We'll try to get the puck to him as much as we can," left wing Geoff Courtnall said. "Of course, the way he can score you're always trying to get it to him anyway."

Hull is trying to become only the fifth player in NHL history to get 50 goals in 50 games, joining Wayne Gretzky, Mario Lemieux, Mike Bossy and Maurice Richard. It'll be up to the Detroit Red Wings to try to stop him, with games on Friday at Detroit and Saturday in St. Louis, but stopping him won't be easy since Hull has three goals and five assists in four games against Detroit.

"I don't want to jinx him in any way, but I'd say it's money in the bank," Blues defenseman Jeff Brown said. "Whenever there's a milestone within reach, he seems to come through. He'll probably get them both on Friday."

Hull's also confident, if a little starchy-eyed.

"Such is the historical importance of 'gripping' in this country that a man, to stand on his own feet, in a powerfully changing world, must keep himself up by his own gripes." — Erik H. Erikson.

"Not only do I find two finesses offside," gripped South, "but I also get the most damaging lead."

Look over the play to see if you can spot when and how the damage really took place.

Dummy's club ace won, and South took the spade finesse before touching trumps. He wanted to ensure a spade ruff in dummy, so in a choice between spades and hearts, it was clear that spades should come first.

But that was not the only problem, as South soon discovered. West won his spade king and led another club to establish a club winner for the defense, and regardless of how South might squirm after that, he had to lose a trick in each suit for one down.

South makes his game if he avoids the club loser, a mission he can accomplish with good timing. Instead of playing either major, South should lead a diamond to his jack at trick two. West wins and continues clubs, but dummy wins and South discards a club on the second of dummy's high diamonds. Now it's right to try the spade finesse, and although it loses, South still has an easy time winning his 10 tricks.

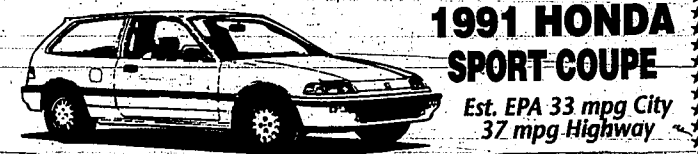

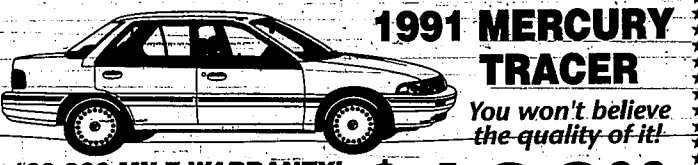

## Actor brings Mark Twain back to life

TWIN FALLS — It could possibly be shown by facts and figures that there is no distinctly native criminal class in the United States... except for Congress.  
"In the first place, God made idiots. This was for practice. Then he made school-boards."

TWIN FALLS — Ken Richters will present "Mark Twain on Tour" at 7 p.m. today in Fine Arts Auditorium at the College of Southern Idaho.

Tickets, \$2 per person, will be available at the door.

Richters' appearance is sponsored by the Associated Students of the College of Southern Idaho and partially funded by the National Foundation for Literature and the Arts.

In 1991, Andrew Dice Clay and Roseanne Barr will have long been forgotten. But the wit of 19th-century American writer and humorist Mark Twain will probably still be bringing small, knowing smiles to Americans of the 21st century.

That is, if people like Ken Richters keep bringing Twain to life. Richters will present his one-man show as Mark Twain at the College of Southern Idaho tonight, one of 130 appearances he will make this year.

Richters is a seasoned actor in his late 30s who looks more familiar than famous, probably owing to his many appearances on television shows (including "Happy Days" and several soap operas) and commercials.

As a teen-ager, he once did a reading of Twain for extra credit in a high school class.

Years later, he was driving across the country, moving from California to New York. He saw a sign pointing to Hannibal, Mo., hometown of Samuel Clemens, who later took the pen name Mark Twain.

There, he stayed in the Mark Twain Hotel and ate in the Mark Twain Diner. "Everything is Mark Twain there," Richters said in a telephone interview last week.

And there, his car broke down and he had to stay a while and get it fixed. "It sounds like fate," Richters recalled. "It had broken down three or four times before that, but in Hannibal, it really broke down."

So that's how Richters' interest in Twain was rekindled: For the next three years, he studied Twain's works and started putting together the show, which he has now been performing for 12 years.

Richters does his own makeup before the show, a process that takes about three hours. He plays Twain as an older man, donning the familiar white suit that was a Twain trademark.

Twain is now Richters' "annuity," as he calls it. But the Connecticut-based actor keeps active in other projects, including a recently filmed pilot for Fox TV called "Badge 379," in which he plays a detective.

About every 15 months, Richters takes Twain abroad, and he reported that British audiences are more responsive than those in the United States.

"I hate to say it, but I think it's the educational system in the U.S., frankly," Richters said. American audiences consist primarily of "40-year-old Yuppie Protestants," he observed.

"But in England, you look out to the front row and have a 75-year-old white-haired woman sitting next to a 15-year-old punk rocker with a safety pin through his ear next to a middle-aged family next to a 12-year-old kid who brought himself to the show," Richters said. "They seem to have a stronger tradition of going to the theater."  
"I think it really needs to begin in grammar school and

high school," Richters added. If students aren't introduced to the arts in school, he said, it's unlikely they'll attend arts events as adults.

Richters said he believes that, if Twain were alive today, he would be against the conflict in the Persian Gulf. "But I don't think he'd be marching in front of the White House," he added. "He would probably be on the Carson show."

"Twain was never one to say 'War is bad, why are we fighting?'" Richters said. "His style was more to show how stupid people could be, looking ahead to preventing future wars, and always maintaining a sense of humor."  
To illustrate, Richters cited Twain's "A War Prayer."

The story is set in a church where townspeople are gathered before they send their sons off to war. A messenger from God comes in and says God has heard their prayers, but that God doesn't know what to do: The other side is praying, too, and just as loudly, for victory and for their sons' safe returns.

"I think he was trying to point out the stupidity of people not being able to grasp that point — that there is another side and they're no different than us. They believe in their cause as much as we believe in ours," Richters said, noting that Twain lived through the Civil War. "I think he would no doubt have the same reaction now."

## War makes superstar out of CNN's Bernard Shaw

Bernard Shaw, the CNN news anchor who may be the No. 4 TV news star of the week-old gulf war, hates all the media attention he's getting and thinks it's "a curse."

Ironically, Shaw said so Wednesday during a two-hour telephone press conference with dozens of reporters, arranged by CNN to take advantage of all the media attention.

Even though he'd rather go hide somewhere, Shaw reluctantly concedes it's "part of the job." So he's striking while the iron is hot. He's doing the publicity until it hurts. And when he's done, said Shaw, he'll look over all the book deals, job offers and other proposals and decide which ones to take, hopefully without screwing up his life.

"I refuse to allow this boomlet of publicity and attention to overwhelm me, my family or my job," he said. "I am going to remain a normal human being."

Like it or not, though, Shaw probably isn't going to be a normal human being from now on. Overnight, he moved up to superstar status in the news business in the minds of millions of viewers who remained glued to their sets last week to hear his reports from Baghdad, where he was trapped in Room 906 of the Al-Rasheed Hotel, with fellow CNN reporters John Holliman and Peter Arnett during the first Allied air raids on the Iraqi capital.

Shaw's experience isn't unique. Major news events that seize the nation's full attention can make stars of the TV reporters who cover them exceptionally well. It happened, for instance, to Shaw's CBS counterpart, Dan Rather, who became a news star after being stranded on Galveston Island during Hurricane Carla and sending out exclusive reports for three hectic days.

For that matter, Shaw's idol, the late Edward R. Murrow, became the reigning presence at CBS News after filing memorable radio reports from the London blitzes of World War II.

So far, the gulf war has provided great opportunities for promising network news personalities to take a big step up — NBC's Faith Daniels and Katherine Couric have been particularly impressive in their war assignments — and has pushed many lesser-known correspondents to the forefront among them: CBS' Scott Pelley and Allen Pizzey, NBC's Arthur Kent and CNN's Charles Jaco.

But the most intense attention has fallen on the three CNN correspondents who became the only U.S. voices from Baghdad during the first three days of the war: Arnett, Holliman and Shaw.

Arnett, a veteran war correspondent who won a Pulitzer Prize for his Vietnam coverage, remains in Baghdad, reporting under heavy Iraqi censorship. (He came under White House fire Wednesday for echoing the Iraqi government line in a report about an air strike.)

Holliman, who returned to the U.S. with Shaw over the weekend and took part in the press conference, is grateful for the positive publicity, but has no illusions about becoming a big-money news star and intends to remain at CNN.

"I've had a couple of offers," he said. "But I don't think I'm going to be changed by this. My wife says I'm still the same goofy fat, balding guy I was when I left."

But, of them all, Shaw is in the best position. Please see CNN/D2

# Intelligence fills smoldering 'Russia House'

Very often, movies can be too smart—for their own good—but in "The Russia House," Fred Schepisi's exceptional film of the best-selling John le Carré espionage novel, intelligence is a stirring, scintillating virtue.

The novel, which has been elegantly adapted by Tom Stoppard, makes a labyrinth out of the geopolitical status quo. In this world nothing can be known absolutely; everything is relative, shrouded in layer upon layer of lies, manipulations and disinformation. But Schepisi navigates the maze expertly, cleanly laying out the action so that we're drawn inside the puzzle. The movie challenges us to keep everything straight, as the very best thrillers do, and in the process makes putting together all the pieces its own heady pleasure.

The events of the film turn on what could be a major feckling of secrets. A manuscript containing the Soviet military master plan falls into the hands of British intelligence. It could be "the pot of gold." Or it could be a shrewdly manufactured bundle of disinformation. The man who wrote it—a reclusive physicist—publishes himself Dante (Klaus Maria Brandauer)—may be on the level, or he may be a KGB puppet trying to sucker the West into lowering its guard.

Whatever turns out to be true, the CIA doesn't like it. The agency also has a major problem: the man who was originally meant to receive the document—a broken-down, boozy publisher by the name of Barley Blair (Sean Connery)—makes frequent trips to the Soviet Union and may be what the agency says is a man who loves the Russian people, or a misguided peacenik or worse. At first Barley has no idea what's going on. The courier—an editor for a Soviet publishing firm named Katya (Michelle Pfeiffer)—was supposed to take the material to Barley, who had impressed Dante at a Soviet writers' conference. Instead she dropped it into the hands of a colleague, who passed it on to the British authorities.

Dante had wanted Barley to

publish his manuscript, but of course the intelligence communities in England and America won't allow that. Before they can determine what to do with it, though, they must determine whether it's true. And so Barley—protesting all the way—is sent back to Russia to make contact with Katya—and, if all goes well, with Dante himself.

Even with all these spider-webbed plot details to sort through, "The Russia House" is more character-centered than most spy thrillers. Much of the film's action, such as it is, takes the form of interrogations, and Schepisi has turned them into tense verbal chess matches.

It helps, of course, that the actors play their pieces brilliantly. Pfeiffer's Barley is a well-served reprobate with hipster tendencies who's gone his own way without much in the way of responsibilities or, for that matter, achievements. Barley is a shambles, like his beloved Russia, but he's his very own shambles. When the spooks grill him, he

knows he has nothing to lose and turns their questions back on them with hilarious panache.

This may be the most complex character Connery has ever played, and without question it's one of his richest performances. Connery shows the melancholy behind Barley's pickled charm, all the wasted years and unkept promises Barley isn't used to being taken seriously or dependent on. What draws him, at first, into spying for the West is the chance it gives him to do something decent for a change. After he meets Katya, though, he has a second motive.

Pfeiffer's Katya is the linchpin in the drama, the straight arrow whose moral authority anchors the events, and with a less-gifted actress the character could be a humorless drone. What saves Pfeiffer is the shy girliness that peeks out from behind Katya's brusque skepticism. Katya wants to be all business, a blank-faced pro, but she can't help but respond to Barley's wry gal-

lantries.

The romance between Katya and Barley doesn't follow the usual path. Their scenes are interrogations too. But beneath the business agenda, a subterranean seduction is taking place. Their romance is the biggest secret of all—even perhaps to them—and the tension between them, as they work on two channels at once, keeping their true feelings cloaked from each other, is intoxicating.

Pfeiffer gives us the whole woman. Her triumph goes beyond her facility with the Russian accent; other actresses could have done that. She's great at playing contradictions, at being tough yet yielding, cloaked yet open, direct yet oblique. What's she's playing, we suspect, is the great Russian game of hide-and-seek. But Pfeiffer gives it a personal dimension. Katya holds herself in check, but her wariness, one senses, is as much personal as it is cultural—the result, perhaps, of her own secret wounds. It's one of the year's most full-blooded performances.

# 'Kindergarten' tames Schwarzenegger into pussycat

**KINDERGARTEN COP (PG-13).** The gentling of Arnold Schwarzenegger, first presented as a stubbled, lone-wolf cop with a taste for vicious vigilante tactics, and gradually tamed into a family-loving pussycat by his undercover surveillance job as a kindergarten teacher. The last word in glib, shallow, soulless, spuriously warm-hearted commercialism. Director Ivan Reitman and the usual consortium of writers barely miss a trick or a marketing hook. Of all the recent "trailer" movies—films that resemble elongated trailers—this may be the most fool-proof.

**DANCES WITH WOLVES (PG-13).** In his first directing work, Kevin Costner has made a clear-eyed authentic vision of the frontier Northwest that is irresistible. The story of a Union officer who becomes assimilated with a tribe of

Siouxs, it has all the elements of epic vastness, astonishing action, sequences, exotic-seeming characters but because it's more concerned with character than spectacle, its

epic quality becomes engaging, never self-congratulatory. Beautiful, memorable and full of humor, it's one of the most winning films of the year.

# 20 miles of cable plus 'New Kids' show make Super Bowl Sunday the big one

In what is now a national rite, an estimated 118 million viewers will tune in to ABC's coverage of Super Bowl XXV on Sunday, Jan. 27.

Al Michaels, Frank Gifford and Dan Dierdorf will be the announcers. ABC is pulling out all the stops: A total of 22 cameras, 16 videotape machines, 50 microphones, 75 television monitors, and 20 miles of cable will be used to broadcast the game.

The half-time show will be an extravaganza featuring New Kids on the Block and a cast of over 2,000 children. And several new commercials will appear in the advertising slots that have sold for a mere \$800,000 per 30 seconds.

But for all the preparations, the network faces one big uncertainty: Will the game itself be worth watching? Viewers turned away in droves during last year's 55-10 massacre of the Denver Broncos by the San Francisco 49ers. Is the Super Bowl often so dull?

Let's look back at some of the games and teams of the past 10 years. The '80s saw the emergence of the San Francisco 49ers, a superb team that won all four of its Super Bowl appearances in 1982, 1983, 1989 and 1990. In contrast, the Denver Broncos have emulated the Minnesota Vikings of the '70s, appearing in—and losing—games in 1987, 1988 and 1990.

The 49ers' four victories were not all walkovers. They barely made it to their first Super Bowl (XVI in 1982) on the fingertips of Dwight Clark, who made a brilliant end-

zone catch against Dallas in the NFC Championship Game. The key to their Super Bowl victory over the Cincinnati Bengals was a third-quarter goal-line stand. Three times the Bengals tried to score from the 1-yard line, and three times they were thrown back.

And in a 49er-Bengal Super Bowl rematch seven years later, it looked as though Cincinnati would pull off an upset, until Joe Montana drove the 49ers 92 yards in the final minutes.

Washington's two Super Bowl victories in the '80s were both memorable. In 1983, John Riggins rumbled 166 yards behind the blocking of the huge Redskin offensive line. Washington trailed the Miami Dolphins in the fourth quarter, but then Riggins blasted through the Miami line for a 43-yard touchdown on a fourth-and-1 play. The

Redskins went on to win, 27-17.

In 1988's Super Bowl XXII against the Denver Broncos, Redskin quarterback Doug Williams conducted a football clinic. He started the second quarter with an 80-yard touchdown pass to Ricky Sanders, and by the time the quarter ended, Washington had scored 35 points.

Washington won, 42-10, and, after years of obscurity, Williams was named the game's Most Valuable Player.

In 1986's Super Bowl XX, the Chicago Bears did what they had been saying for weeks that they would: They whipped the New England Patriots, 46-10.

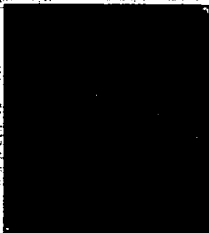

In addition, Harold Russell, a real-life war veteran who had lost both of his hands in a hand-grenade explosion, won an Oscar for his moving performance in "The Best Years of Our Lives." And Marlee Matlin, who is deaf, won for "Children of a Lesser God."

**Q:** What ever happened to John Denver's plan to become a civilian astronaut? Was it all just publicity? — A.R.

**A:** As in most things, John remains earnest about his astronaut aspirations. He says he'd like to slow things down — professionally speaking — in the coming year. Despite this, he added, the trip in space is still very much on his mind. But it looks as if it'll be a case of hope over reality for some time. Denver may ultimately have to settle in the stratosphere somewhere near a Rocky Mountain high.

**Q:** What's this about the father of George Wendt, the happy-go-lucky Norm of "Cheers," being a real hard-nosed, military man who fights furiously with his famous son? — M.R.

**A:** George's father — who looks a lot like him or, should I say, vice versa — owns a real estate company in Chicago. He's a delightful man, not a stuffed shirt military type even though he retired as a captain in the Navy Reserves. George Jr. is his

dad's favorite actor, of course. The senior Wendt tells me he has on videotape a copy of every "Cheers" episode ever made.

**Q:** Is Faye Dunaway really the temperamental star she's depicted to be by the press? — Y.H.

**A:** The 49-year-old Dunaway, one of the last of those actresses who came through the old Hollywood system, is known as a perfectionist and, as such, will not be satisfied unless her standards are met. She has been known to routinely take four hours preparing for an interview during which time hairdressers, makeup artists and clothing stylists are at her mercy in the performance of their jobs. When she emerges, her physical transformation into movie star completed, she is a different person — gracious, charming and cooperative.

**Q:** Is Sean Connery one of those English actors trained on the London stage? — T.V.

**A:** The 60-year-old Connery, still viewed as a sex symbol by women all over the world, is not English. Born in the slums of Edinburgh, Scotland, Thomas Connery enlisted at 15 in the British Navy. Following his discharge, he supported himself by odd jobs that included life-guarding and coffin polishing. He began entering body-building competitions, changed his name to Sean, modeled, acted on the London stage sans formal training and appeared on British television and in movies. He was working as a milkman, when he

was cast in "Dr. No," the first James Bond film.

**Q:** Are the children who appear with Arnold Schwarzenegger in "Kindergarten Cop" professional actors? — G.B.

**A:** The majority of the children featured in the film are not professional actors. Director Ivan Reitman worked with the film's casting director and auditioned more than 2000 Southern California children from whom 30, ages 4 to 7, were ultimately selected. Since many of the younger children could not read, they relied on their parents to teach them their lines. By the end of production, Reitman says, many parents were well on their way to becoming classic Hollywood stage parents.

**Q:** How has Dana Delany adjusted to the overnight success she achieved with "China Beach" and has it gone to her head like so many others? — C.O.

**A:** First of all, Delany's success on "China Beach" could hardly be labeled "overnight." Like so many actors who at last emerge with the perfect role, Delany "paid her dues." She previously appeared in the short-lived NBC comedy series "Sweet Surrender," and was seen as a former lover of Bruce Willis on "Moonlighting" and as Tom Selleck's love interest in "Magnum, P.I." Delany has also appeared in feature films, including "Masquerade," "Moon Over Parador" and "Patty Hearst."

**A:** No. Nell Carter was a teenager when her daughter, Tracey, was born. **Q:** Having recently seen the new Woody Allen film "Alice," I was fascinated by the actor who played Dr. Yang. Can you tell me something about him? — D.I.

**A:** Keye Luke, best remembered as the Number One son in Charlie Chan films, died on Jan. 12 at age 86. He was born in Canton and at age 3 came to the United States where his family settled in Seattle. He arrived in Hollywood during the '20s and, finding few jobs available for Chinese-American actors, found employment as an artist doing billboards and posters for Grauman's Chinese Theater.

He was cast in a 1934 Garbo movie, which eventually led to his memorable role in the Charlie Chan films. Luke has appeared in more than 100 films, on Broadway in "Flower Drum Song," and in the television series, "Kung Fu," in which he played the teacher. He was recently honored with a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame. It was placed just across from Grauman's Chinese Theater.

**Q:** We hear that Jackie Kennedy Onassis always shows up at public occasions followed by a mean-looking bodyguard, who is female. Is that true? — A.R.

**A:** When Jackie showed up in New York at the 30th birthday of her son, John Kennedy Jr., she was on the arm of writer George Plimpton, a longtime friend. Also close at hand was Jackie's bodyguard — yes, a woman. I wouldn't characterize the bodyguard as "mean-looking," but I wouldn't want to be the one to cause trouble around the former first lady when this watcher was nearby.

of Sean McAllister during the first season of the primetime soap "The Colbys" in 1985-86. In comparing the two men who did have some similarities, Charles said Sean and Charlie are both rebels, pushing the parameters of who they are but that Sean was a little less aggressive than Charlie.

"Charlie is definitely looking out for number one," said Van Eman. "He does what he likes and has his own self interest in mind almost always. Charlie crosses boundaries between hero and villain but not so emphatically that he can be labeled one or the other. He's also a fun-loving guy and that's probably what

makes him appealing to an audience, at least at this point in the storyline."

Charles is still a bit surprised that he is actually a working actor, not that he hasn't worked hard to get where he is. But he didn't start out to be an actor until he was in college.

Even then, he didn't really give into the desire until he actually dropped out of school for a few semesters, went back and got his degree in business and actually was thinking of joining the nine-to-fivers in the corporate world of big business.

"I had this big interview set up and they wine and dined me for a few days," said Van Eman. "I

thought this is what I was going to do with my life and then all of a sudden, I knew I had to see if I could make it as an actor. It was a strong feeling and I knew I had to give into it. I called the company that was going to hire me and told the personnel manager my decision. I'm sure the guy thought I was insane when I said I was going to be an actor."

With just a couple of hundred dollars in his pocket, Charles set out for California with a short stopover in Arizona to see an old girlfriend. He enrolled in drama classes and started to live the life of many aspiring actors — working as a waiter and making the rounds of casting directors.

# News programs draw record ratings as Persian Gulf events draw viewers

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC network news earned its highest ratings in history last week when war in the Persian Gulf brought record numbers of viewers to television.

More than 13 million American homes were tuned to ABC news and Peter Jennings when U.S.-led attacks against Iraq began Jan. 16.

ABC's total for Jan. 14 to Jan. 20 was about 4 million households higher than its closest network news competitor.

ABC earned a 14.8 average rating, NBC and Tom Brokaw earned a 10.4 average rating for their war coverage, followed by CBS and Dan Rather with 10.1, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

The Cable News Network, whose highly celebrated reports periodically featured the only live transmissions from the Iraqi capital under siege, broke all cable ratings records Jan. 16 by earning a 19.1 average. That figure represents 10.8 million cable households of a total of 56.8 million.

The Nielsen broadcast network ratings are averaged to reflect viewership among the nation's 93.1 million TV households.

Cable ratings are averaged to reflect viewership among the nation's 56.8 million cable subscriber homes. The two sets of ratings are not equivalent.

Weekly ratings for CNN were not available Tuesday.

CBS won the overall prime-time network race, aided by high ratings for the Sunday newsmagazine "60 Minutes" and a post-game show to the National Football League conference showdown between the San Francisco 49ers and the New York Giants.

In a week marked by two nights of continuous news pre-emptions, the top 10 list of entertainment programs was headed by "60 Minutes," and followed by the Giants-49ers post-game show. In third was ABC's "Roseanne."

CBS' "Murder She Wrote" was fourth.

Monday's ABC prime-time news special "A Line in the Sand," broadcast two days before U.S.-led forces

attacked Baghdad, finished fifth. It earned the network's highest ratings ever for a news special.

CBS' Monday night lineup of "Murphy Brown" and "Designing Women" tied for sixth, followed by NBC's "Matlock" on Jan. 15.

ABC's live coverage of the Jan. 16 bombing was ninth.

"In the Heat of the Night" on NBC was tenth.

NBC's Jan. 16 war coverage ranked 15th—CBS' initial bombing coverage finished 30th.

Nielsen included prime-time newscasts without commercials in its rankings but did not figure in the newscasts' viewers in the overall prime-time ratings.

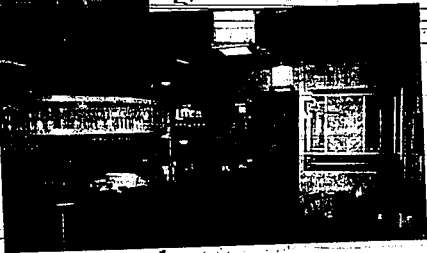
