Trapped recon teams give Marines stake in battle

The Associated Press — **KHAFJI**, Saudi Arabia — The incessant barking of a dog somewhere in the desert rose above the low rumble of idling Saudi and Qatar armor assembled in the parking lot of a looted gas station. The rows of tanks—armored personnel carriers and Marine humvees—were set for a final assault to evict Iraqi troops from this Saudi border town. It was the Saudi Army's job, but Marines had a stake in the operation: two of their reconnaissance teams were trapped in Khafji. "We're going to hold things down until they're able to come through," said Capt. Jamal, a Jordanian-born Marine who did not give his first name.

Water outlook remains bleak for Magic Valley

TWIN FALLS, Idaho — It looks as if the Magic Valley is headed into its sixth drier-than-normal year. Bureau of Reclamation officials have started using the "drought" word, said Mike Beus of the bureau's Burley office. "Every time we do that the weather changes," he said. And with the current southwesterly flow of air, the weather pattern could change, bringing moisture to southern Idaho. "But I sure doesn't look good from where we sit now," Beus said. The snowpack in the mountains above the major reservoirs that store irrigation water and supply stream flows in the Snake River and well below the average, he said. "In northern Idaho, the snowpack is about 40 percent of the winter's snowpack by Jan. 1 and 60 percent by Feb. 1. The snowpack in the drainages above the Salmon Falls Creek and Oakley reservoirs is about 62 percent of average. It is a little better than this time last year, but last year more water was left in the reservoirs."

DHAKHAN, Saudi Arabia — Allied forces cascaded bombs on a 10-mile-long Iraqi armored column headed into Saudi Arabia and snatched back a Saudi town from defiant Iraqi tank troops Thursday.

12 B-52 bombers rained a firestorm of explosives on the Iraq column, said the 1,600 vehicles long, according to a pool report by a British reporter with Britain's 6th Armored Brigade, near the Kuwaiti border.

Saturday, fighting flared again in the frontier town of Khafji and military officers said four Iraqi armored brigades were on the move north of the border, about 10 miles north of Khafji.

The B-52s refueled in the air as they attacked the tanks, which were fighting along a 14-mile stretch of the border, the British pool report said.

It quoted an intelligence report that at least 100 Iraqi tanks had been destroyed since Saddam's forces thrust across the border Tuesday night. The Baghdad-based total of 77 tanks and other vehicles were destroyed and 167 prisoners taken.

Saudi Gen. Khalid Bin Sultan said his troops, backed by U.S. Marines, had captured 350 Iraqi prisoners in driving the Iraqis out of Khafji, which they seized Tuesday night. But fighting resumed Friday.

In Washington, Army Lt. Gen. Thomas Kelly termed the performance of Iraqi troops as "pretty shabby," saying the forces metched nothing other than to be mowed down.

Iraq said its incursions at Khafji and other border points signaled the start of a "thunderous storm" on the desert floor.

Eleven Marines died in the Iraqi attacks and a U.S. Special Operations plane with 14 aboard was shot down behind Israeli U.S. military officials said. Two other Americans, including a woman, were missing.

U.S. Marines have reported evidence of five or six Iraqi divisions, at least 60,000 soldiers, in a region near the Kuwaiti town of Wafra, near the Saudi border.

A U.S. air squadron commander, Lt. Col. Dick White, said he struck 10 Iraq tanks Thursday of intelligence reports that 1,000 Iraqi vehicles were moving toward the border.

Allied aircraft dumped a firestorm of munitions on Iraq's top troops in Kuwait, the crack Republican Guards. Iraq, in turn, lofted another Scud missile into the Israeli-occupied West Bank. Israeli officials said there were no casualties.

Pay raise takes effect

The Associated Press — **BOISE** — The 82-percent pay raise a citizens commission approved for Idaho legislators last year has become irrevocable, leaving lawmakers' wallets open to a constant whine to do without the unwanted cash.

Three eastern Idaho legislators say they may dedicate it to education. Others, like Rep. Con Mahoney, R-Idaho Falls, say they haven't given the matter any thought.

Mahoney, chairman of the Republican caucus in the House, sponsored a resolution to reject the raise authorized by a seven-member citizens commission during the 1990 session of the Legislature. The gainet was obtained by constitutional amendment in 1976 to handle legislative pay.

The commission, headed by Idaho Falls attorney Timothy Hopkins, has repeatedly proposed increasing lawmakers' pay — and expense reimbursement, too — to seal political pressure force lawmakers to reduce or reject the raises.

Most legislators said they heard little from their constituents on the latest move to raise their pay from \$6,600 to \$12,000 per year and increase expense allowances, with an extra \$3,000 for the Senate president pro tem and House speaker. The commission also increased the number of paid trips home for out-of-town lawmakers from seven to once a week during the session.

The raise took effect Dec. 1, but the Legislature has until 2:30 p.m. today to vote Thursday to reduce or reject the changes. A resolution to reject the raise passed the House 46-38 before being buried in the Senate State Affairs Committee.

Florida reports record high temperatures

Winds howled through the Rockies and in the East where snow also fell Thursday, while the mercury rose to record high temperatures in Florida.

High wind warnings were posted for the Mustanga front along the Rockies and the upper Yellowstone Valley, and warnings for gale-force winds were in effect along the northern Atlantic Coast, as well as across Lake Erie, Lake Ontario and the Laurel Mountains in southwest Pennsylvania.

The Soil Conservation Service's Twin Falls office predicts the state's runoff and water supply on the basis of the monthly snowpack figures.

But if predictions are based on the premise that snowpack on these dates is representative of the winter's accumulation, and they assume there will be normal weather for the remainder of the winter.

The SCS' report of a normal precipitation for the rest of the winter runoff into the Salmon River Creek Reservoir is likely to be about 72 percent of average. Runoff into Oakley Reservoir will probably be about 70 percent of average, said Rich Vankey of the SCS.

The Maple Reservoir story is less optimistic. The damages that feed the reservoir, the Wood River and Lost River basins, have only about 40 percent of normal moisture in their basins, according to SCS soil moisture, the conglomeration of soil preloading, only about 34 percent of the average runoff into the reservoir.

That means we'd have to have 200 percent of normal snowfall for the rest of the winter to make up for that," said Peter Palmer, snow survey supervisor for the SCS.

"When have we seen that for one month, much less two?"

"That's a real scary report," said the expected runoff into Apple's still would be normal 70,000 acre feet, less than normal, according to conservation service figures.

The Maple valley got about about 20 inches of snow, but precipitation in an already dry winter. Precipitation for the water year that started Oct. 1 is 2.16 inches, or 1.64 inches below the average, according to National Weather Service figures.

"The weather service is still kind of dry," said Bill Walker of the Kimberly weather service station.

In the liquid moonlight, it seemed too peaceful a night for war. Then, as the stars started off, the night turned to chaos.

Easy, rope-voiced machine gun tracers stitched across the road from two directions. Rocket-powered grenades shot into vehicle ranks, setting one armored personnel carrier ablaze in the shock of the explosion and killing going.

"War sucks, sir," said the driver, his voice seething with fear and exhilaration.

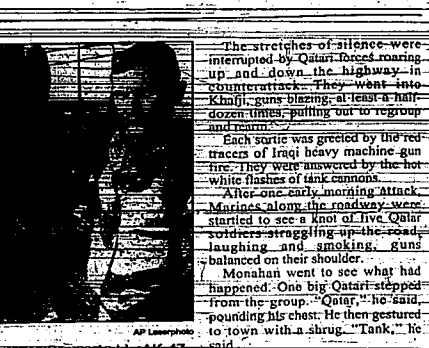

So began a long night's watch for the mechanized 4th Division Marines, who huddled around humvee radios, listening for their brethren.

The recon team members had plenty to say. They reported on

The stretches of silence were interrupted down the highway in counterattack. They went into Khaffi, guns blazing, at least a half-dozen times, pulling out to regroup and train.

Each hour was greeted by the red traces of Iraqi heavy machine gun fire. They were answered by the hot white flashes of tank cannons.

After one early morning attack, Banner said, he saw a lot of the Qatir laughing and smoking guns balanced on his shoulder.

Monahan went to see what had happened. One big Qatir stepped from the group. "Qatir," he said, "pounded his chest. He then gestured to town with a shrug. "Tank," he said.

"The Marines spent the night mostly huddling in the night vehicles, waiting for word of the recon unit. It came later in the morning when the first missing link showed up at the staging area. They were greeted with handshakes and backslaps.

Among them was Cpl. Ben Banner, carrying a scorched AK-47 assault rifle. Banner climbed a front end of the staging area. They had destroyed with two anti-tank missiles.

An exhausted Banner told of eating ration packs of instant coffee to stay awake during the 48 hours he stayed in a case out of hide-and-seek with the Iraqis.

"Everything was crazy," he said. Banner began to gulp water from a liter bottle. It trembled slightly in his hands.

Alliance challenges Andrus plan

PORTLAND (AP) — The Columbia River Alliance for Fish & Commerce is challenging the proposal of Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus for flushing main-stem Columbia Basin reservoirs in the spring to increase survival of migrating salmon.

John Lannan of Oregon State University says the governor's proposal to head-off endangered species listing for the autonomous fish runs could have its own adverse impact on the river's well-being on the economics of the coastal states.

"Substantially changing the flow regime of the river introduces a new set of environmental uncertainties into its system written unpredictably about the effects on fish," Lannan said in a statement.

But Andrus spokesman Scott Boyton plugged off the criticism, pointing out that the proposal of the governor is the members of the Salmon Summit last week included details on the biological effect and ramifications of the drawdown on fish migration as well as mitigation of problems for irrigation and navigation.

"At least we've got a plan," Boyton said. "The governor has said he'll be there forward for every idea — bring them forward."

While there has been some focus on using water in Idaho's Snake River Basin to flush fish in the ocean in the spring, the Andrus administration provided an analysis that showed the limited amounts of stored water in Idaho would do nothing to increase the velocity of the water flowing through the slack Columbia River estuary. The state maintained the only way to increase the velocity of water is to draw down reservoirs during migration.

"That would carry economic consequences," admits on the Columbia River Basin, the conglomeration of an endangered species designation would be even worse.

Said Palm Bureau lobbyist Dave Bliven: "We have to have some assurance of property tax relief."

Pete Skamer, representing the National Federation of Independent Business, added: "I think the bill is incredibly overboard."

He said it would "impose tax laws, and because it was so vague."

The twins of Pocatello and Boise urged support for the bill along with Banker County, Idaho, and city representatives from Kelchum and Halley.

Twin Falls Mayor Tom Condie said his community has reduced its property tax by 25 percent since 1980 but still has been forced to finance fund services. He denied that Twin Falls, or any other city, would get out of control if given authority to decide its own finances.

"We are very responsive to the citizens," he said.

Ketchum City Administrator Jim Jaquet said his first community tax audit showed special taxing authority to cut its reliance on property taxes. Property taxes made up 73 percent of the city's revenue. "We have a large number of tax-exempt properties, but none make up only 10 percent."

"Our local option tax has worked well," Jaquet said.

Condie has the same problems as Ketchum but, less ability to finance the services, said City Council member Mary Ann Mix. Halley's mayor, "I have a declining industry but we have a declining industry to all the impacts of a resort community and no ability to improve its infrastructure."

Desert Storm

Cleanup force lacks equipment

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Saudi Arabia lacks the equipment necessary to protect some of its drinking water plants from the world's largest oil spill off its coast.

A shortage of booms and skimmers also has forced the kingdom to postpone efforts to save wildlife from the oil, which the United States says Iraq deliberately dumped into the Persian Gulf from a Kuwaiti loading terminal. Officials said the lack of equipment could make it necessary to close some of the oil desalination plants that make sea water drinkable.

Fishes, birds, and other marine life are being killed, and other sea life, leaving a toxic legacy for years.

A second slick, said to be pouring from oil wells in Iraq, could make the problem worse.

"Right now, there's not enough equipment to protect what our priorities are," said Lt. Cmdr. Paul Milligan of the Coast Guard, part of a U.S. team helping with the cleanup.

"That's why we're making this worldwide effort to bring equipment in."

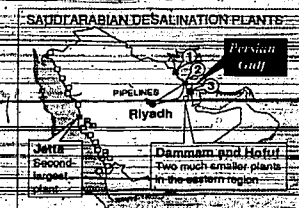
So far, the United States, Germany, Britain and Norway have sent equipment to Iraq, could make the problem worse.

The huge spill began last week, when Iraq occupied forces in Kuwait allegedly opened the taps at the Sea Island terminal. President Bush called it "environmental terrorism."

By Thursday afternoon, the tip of the slick was moving south down the coast from Ra's al Zaur, a small peninsula. Oil executives said the 300-mile-long slick is about 20 miles wide and 20 miles long. It is about 20 miles from the largest desalination plant at Jubail, which processes 30 million gallons of water a day for Riyadh, the capital, and eastern Saudi Arabia.

The slick is about 12 miles wide. Other estimates have it at 10 miles wide.

Despite Saudi government claims to be protecting the environment, officials said all efforts were focused on desalting plants, power stations and refineries.



Threatened Plants

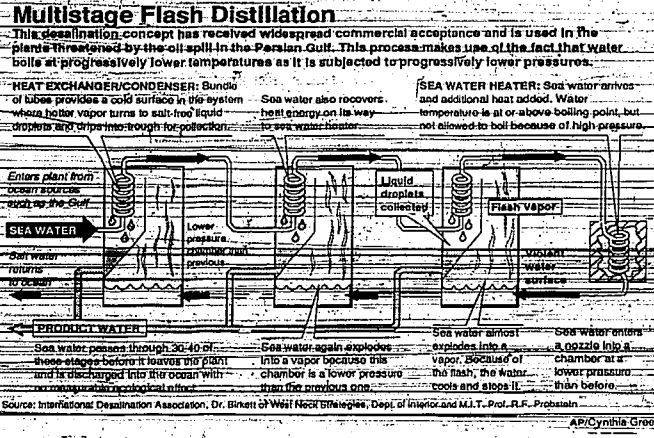
Eighteen units of sea-water pass through these plants to produce one unit of product water.

War developments on Thursday:

A U.S. plane was shot down in the war against Iraq, a Pentagon source said Thursday. The source, speaking on condition of anonymity, would not confirm reports that the craft was an EC-130J Compass Call, an electronic warfare plane. Spokesman Pete Williams said it was a Boeing plane, not the Hercules, downed by U.S. aircraft while on a search and rescue's underway.

At the Pentagon, Lt. Gen. Thomas Kelly said a search was under way for two soldiers — one man and one woman — missing since Wednesday. The two were not directly involved in the fighting at the Jordanian Saudi port of Khafji, the military said.

Allied planes continued to bombard Iraqi targets, with more than 2,600 sorties flown in the past 24 hours, the Pentagon said. In contrast, Iraqi planes flew only eight sorties, it said.

A White House spokesman said "consumer confidence is rising" despite the war. Federal Reserve Board Chairman Alan Greenspan warned that a long war could bring a deep recession.

Allied troops took back the coastal town that saw the Persian Gulf War's first sustained ground fighting, the military said Thursday. However, Iraqis continued to shell Saudi, Qatari and American forces, according to Western reporters in Khafji, 8 miles from the Kuwaiti border in the northeast corner of Saudi Arabia.

Saudi Arabia lacks the equipment to protect some of its drinking water plants from the world's largest oil spill, officials said Thursday. A shortage of booms and skimmers also has forced the kingdom to postpone efforts to save wildlife from the oil.

Israel said an Iraqi Scud-type missile struck the occupied West Bank, but there were no reports of injury or damage. The attack (about 6 p.m. or 11 a.m. EST) was eighth Iraqi missile attack aimed at Israel since the war began.

The New York stock market pushed ahead, extending the broad advance that carried the market to a five-month high on Wednesday. The Dow Jones industrial average rose 2.27 points to close at 2,736.39 on top of Wednesday's 30.50-point jump.

Pilot says Iraqi armored units scurried away like 'cockroaches'

U.S. MARINE BASE IN NORTH-EASTERN SAUDI ARABIA (AP) — A pilot who flew a combat mission against Iraqi armored units during the war against Iraq, which has concentrated on aerial strikes at fixed targets in Iraq and Kuwait.

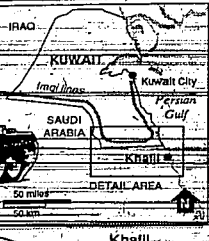

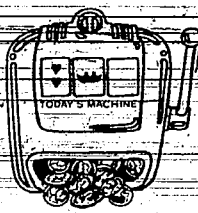

Saudis push Iraqi troops out of Khafji

KHAFJI, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Allied troops retook most of Khafji from an invading Iraqi force Tuesday, but the Iraqis continued shelling U.S., Saudi and Qatari forces with mortar fire throughout the afternoon.

The fighting raged for several hours after the allied military command announced the Saudi frontier had been "completely liberated."

After nightfall, U.S. sources said the town was all but rid of Iraqis, but that dozens of houses were searched by door-to-door searches. Many Iraqi vehicles also were able to avoid attack and return to Kuwait, pilots said.

Marines (AP) — Cobra helicopters in to fight out snipers from the town during the night hours. Later, Saudi army units had taken over most of the deserted town. A Marine vehicle also fired a TOW anti-tank missile and destroyed an Iraqi vehicle on the outskirts of Khafji.

Marines also directed repeated volleys of artillery at Khafji to soften Iraqi positions in the eastern sector of the town.

Despite those actions, and the decision of an American command to send a shoulder-launched missile in Khafji, the U.S. command insisted at its daily briefing in Riyadh that Marines were not engaged in the battle for Khafji.

"Saudi forces have retaken and secured the city," said Brig. Gen. Pat Stevens IV. He said U.S. forces had provided air support, but the action was a coalition action without ground U.S. troops involved.

There were no immediate reports of allied casualties in Khafji, which is eight miles from the Kuwait border. Several Saudis were seen being taken to hospitals and transported in Red Crescent combat ambulances.

Stevens said two U.S. soldiers, a man and a woman, apparently were missing. But he said they were not involved in the ground fighting. A Baghdad official said he was certain that it had taken a number of U.S. male and female soldiers prisoner.

There was speculation that Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein was planning yet another incursion into Saudi territory. Many Saudis say they were sure reports Saddam was missing five or more divisions just north of the

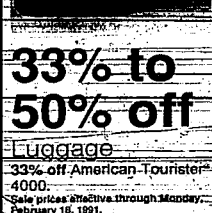

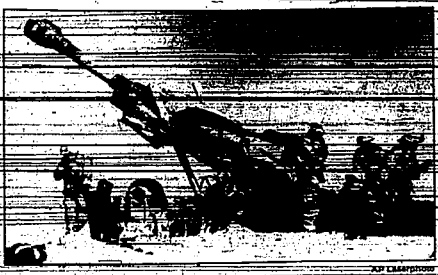

Saddam Hussein's pride and joy: Artillery

WASHINGTON (AP) — Iraq's artillery is the pride and joy of President Saddam Hussein. He has many more guns than the United States, longer ranges and battle-tested gunners, although the American military has more sophisticated guidance and control systems, battlefield flexibility and air support.

Artillery battles were the mainstay of the eight-year Iran-Iraq war, and the Iraqis invested millions of their petrodollars in trying to buy the best guns available. The result is a varied, cosmopolitan inventory: Soviet, Chinese, Austrian, Italian, Brazilian, South African, and even American. Iraq was always on the lookout for better and longer. With the help of a Canadian-born engineer named Gerald Bull, it started building a "super-gun" that would fire rocket-propelled artillery to great distances. The project was derailed when Bull was assassinated last March in Brussels by an unknown gunman, and British customs authorities seized and confiscated components for the weapon.

Iraq's artillery prowess in the current war got its first test this week when Iraqi troops captured the Saudi border town of Khafji and forced the allied defenders to retreat under heavy artillery fire. The campaign to retake Khafji eventually succeeded, but it met fierce resistance from Iraqi mortars and small artillery fire. U.S. Marines fired back with 155-mm cannons. The Iraqis also fired anti-aircraft artillery at allied planes trying to dislodge them with bombing runs. Until the Iraqis ventured across the border, U.S. forces in Saudi Arabia

chemical artillery shells. U.N. investigating teams found that Iraq used artillery shells filled with mustard and nerve gas against the Iranians several times between 1983 and 1988. U.S. analysts say that Iraqi tactics that proved successful against Iran will not work against the allies. The Iraqis followed the classic Soviet doctrine of attacking in waves.

They would pound away at a target for 10 to 12 hours at a time, disorienting and killing the enemy, said Jon Clements, managing editor of *Armor Magazine*. The Iraqis would also map a "kill zone" clearly and set their guns toward locations in that area. They would then pretend to retreat, lure the enemy into the "kill zone" and pound them with artillery, Clements said. But their ability to attack in a mobile or fluid situation was very weak, said Jeff Shaffer, a military analyst at the Center for Strategic and International Studies. U.S. troops, who will be on the move constantly in a ground war, will prove a difficult target, he predicted.

It said the mission, the first since the Persian Gulf War began Jan. 17, was organized in the tracks of the Iranian's Iraqi Red Crescent societies, the Muslim equivalent of the Red Cross.

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — A senior aide to Saddam Hussein and a French Foreign Ministry official arrived in Iran Thursday for talks on the Persian Gulf War, Iran's official media reported. Tehran radio identified the Iraqi official as the deputy prime minister, Saadoun Hamadi. It did not say

whether he would meet the French official. Also arriving in Iran was François Schryer, secretary general of the French Foreign Ministry. The broadcast noted Hamadi's visit followed Iran's declaration that it would not send back Iraqi aircraft that had landed in Iran.

Junk mail an unwelcome avalanche

Editorial

Peavey is right. The rules should apply to everybody

State Sen. John Peavey of Carey recognizes what a number of colleagues won't: Idaho legislators have a credibility problem hiding behind the immunity from arrest afforded them by the state constitution.

The Senate State Affairs Committee earlier this week rejected on a tie vote Peavey's proposed constitutional amendment that would have held lawmakers accountable like everybody else for their transgressions during the legislative session.

At it stands, they're not. Lawmakers can collect tickets by the truckful in their dogged pursuit of the greater public good and never get a visit from the police.

The Idaho State Police have been looking the other way for years, a revelation that cost the state's top law enforcement officers their jobs last fall.

Critics of Peavey's bill in the State Affairs Committee argued that the constitutional provision of immunity did not protect legislators from being held accountable for any legal

violations, but only assured proceedings involving such allegations would not disrupt their official legislative activities during the annual session.

Tell us another one.

The provision was written into the Constitution in 1889 — for different reasons. Back then, territorial lawmakers had legitimate fears that they might be hauled off to the Boise jail for offending the wrong person.

That threat long since has disappeared, but the constitutional tie-leaf remains.

There is something singularly offensive about the people who make our laws seeking refuge from those laws in the Constitution, particularly from traffic law violations.

The vast majority of our lawmakers are scrupulously law-abiding, but the fact that they are willing to countenance those who aren't calls the honesty of the whole Legislature into question.

"One of the fundamental principles of democracy is that the rules apply to everybody. In Idaho, they apply to almost everybody.

So now, the Postal Service wags us to pay 29 cents for a stamp.

Actually, the Postal Service would not pay 29 cents for a stamp, which sounded reasonable to me, a non-mailman.

But the public servants on the postal rate commission, vigilant consumer watchdogs that they are, said NO WAY. Twenty-nine cents and not a penny more, at least not until 1997.

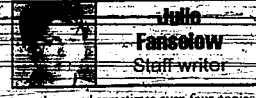
One good thing about the upcoming round of postal-rate increases is this: It will hit the junk mailers — excuse me, direct mail marketers — the hardest. Maybe that will mean fewer catalogs, appeals for money, credit cards, political campaigns and

most especially, fewer pictures of Ed McMahon in my mailbox.

Every American family has tales of how annoying junk mail can be. In fact, I received one letter not long ago that began "Dear Reader, Thank you for taking the time to open this envelope," making it clear that even the direct mailers expect people to throw their missives away unopened.

I used to do that, too. But these days, I strive to be environmentally responsible, which means recycling everything that can be recycled. My friendly local recycling center won't pay for the cheap, low-grade paper most junk mail is printed on, but it will take the paper off my hands and save it from clogging the landfills.

So I have to open the junk mail and sort it, tossing away the stuff that cannot be recycled. Even this doesn't sound so bad until you realize I receive not one but often

two, three and sometimes even four copies of every piece of junk mail.

Here's how it started: Before I moved to Twin Falls two years ago, I rented a post office box so I would have a forwarding address. I still get most of my mail there. But I get some at home, too. That's two addresses.

Tricky matters were used to be married. During that time my last name was Julie Fanslow Swetye — a name that is still on 18,136 mailing lists. And when I was married, some mailers insisted on ignoring my maiden name and called me Julie Swetye, so that version is still floating around, too.

So, in case you haven't been keeping score, I sometimes go to the post office and pick up three copies of the exact same mailing addressed to Julie Fanslow Julie Fanslow Swetye and Julie Swetye.

Then when I get home and look in my own mailbox, I am likely to get a fourth copy.

I throw all this stuff in a pile. Then once a week, I open it all and dutifully sift out the recyclable paper, all while mourning the many trees that fell to make my junk mail.

I realize I brought a lot of junk on myself. I am addicted to magazines. I do a fair

amount of catalog shopping. I belong to several book and record clubs and I occasionally give money to charity.

All these businesses and concerns sell names to mailing list brokers, and — even though Fanslow is one of the oddest surnames around — they can't tell that Julie Fanslow at the post office box and Julie Fanslow southwest of Twin Falls are the same person.

A couple of weeks ago, I realized there had long ago gotten out of hand, and I finally got around to writing the Direct Marketing Association in New York. The association promises to remove your name and address — or in my case, names and addresses — from mailing lists if you ask.

(The address is 6 E. 43rd St., New York, N.Y. 10017.)

I am skeptical whether this will make much difference in my mail glut. Why would a large association of direct mailers willingly take your name off mailing lists?

Even if it really works that way, I know the cycle will eventually start again. I'll subscribe to a new magazine, buy a sweater from a catalog or give \$10 to charity, and my name will once again start making the rounds.

If that happens, maybe I'll give up and start a junk-mail recipients' support group. But if you want to join, just do me one favor.

Amanda grew up to be a happy, bubbly baby. I know only the controlled environment of the NICU as her home. START negotiators remain deadlocked

WASHINGTON — After some Soviet backing, the drive to wrap up strategic arms reduction talks is on track again.

But a handful of tough verification problems continue to defy compromise, and an unmaking of the scheduled superpower summit in Moscow.

Bush administration officials are

breathing easier now that the 1987 talks in Washington with Soviet Foreign Minister Alexander A. Besmertnykh prevented further unraveling of treaty issues near resolution only a few months ago.

But they are feeling the impact of the more assertive role the Soviet military is taking in the arms control negotiations, as well as in the trou-

bled Baltic Republics.

Mikhail S. Gorbachev's key military adviser, Marshal Sergei Akhromov, was not here for the three days of talks. Besmertnykh held with President Bush and Secretary James A. Baker III. That meant a loss of the moderating influence he had exercised on nuclear arms and other weapons issues in recent years.

Hardliners in the Soviet military are considered at least partly responsible for the Kremlin's recent backtracking on the kinds of bombers

that would be restricted under the START treaty, and on rules to guard against heading nuclear warheads.

The United States had insisted for years that the bomber, which the Soviets call the Tupolev 22-M, meets the definition of a strategic weapon under the treaty. That would have meant counting all Backfires — the Pentagon says there are 330 with about 30 more produced each year — against two treaty limits: 6,000 warheads and 1,600 delivery vehicles overall.

Educators want more

WASHINGTON (AP) — A coalition of 100 education groups on Thursday urged President Bush and Congress to double the federal education budget to \$55 billion over five years.

The Committee for Education Funding aired a similar plea last year, when federal education programs were increased 2.6 billion.

CEF President Edward Kealy, who also is director of the National

School Boards Association, acknowledged that federal money is tight because of the recession and the Persian Gulf war.

"Nevertheless, the education of our nation's youth is a continuing and compelling national priority that cannot be set aside," he said, noting total federal appropriations for education have fallen 1.7 percent of all federal spending, compared to 2.5 percent in 1980.

U.S. stand connected to support

WASHINGTON (AP) — Continued Soviet support for the U.S.-led war in the Persian Gulf was linked with a pledge the United States would soften its tough line against the Soviet crackdown in the Baltics, government sources say.

The sources, speaking on condition they not be cited, said an unannounced agreement between Secretary of State James A. Baker III and Soviet Foreign Minister Alexander A. Besmertnykh led to issuance of a joint statement on the Gulf that caught several U.S. allies by surprise.

"We made a rough deal," said one U.S. official, "to the effect this week between Baker and Besmertnykh. We agree to back off on the Gulf that caught several U.S. allies by surprise."

Another source said the United States also received assurances the Soviets would withdraw some of the troops they sent into Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia at the start of a crackdown on the separatist movements in the three tiny Soviet republics in the Baltic Sea.

That pullback has begun, but it is not clear how many Soviet troops will remain. The Red Army has large permanent bases in the region, in addition to the special paratroopers and other forces brought in to round up draft resisters and wrest control from the separatist government.

The crackdown, including Soviet assaults on separatist-held government facilities in Lithuania and Latvia, has resulted in 20 deaths.

President Bush, in his state of the Union address, referred just as the Besmertnykh visit "ended" — and before he had been briefed on the final meeting — restated the administration's deep concern about the violence.

But he also said, "In our recent discussions with the Soviet leadership, we have been given representations, which, if fulfilled, would result in the withdrawal of some Soviet forces, a reopening of dialogue with the republics and a move away from violence."

Housing sales may improve

WASHINGTON (AP) — New home sales plunged 6.7 percent in December, dragging the year's national housing collapse to the worst level since the 1982 depths of the last recession, the government said Wednesday. But analysts expect a gradual recovery will begin by midyear.

The Department of Commerce and Housing and Urban Development reported sales totaled a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 463,000 units in December, the lowest level since 407,000 homes were sold in August 1982.

New home sales in 1990 fell for the second consecutive year, down 15 percent to 3,336,000 units, the smallest number since 413,000 homes were sold in 1982.

Analysis attributed the December loss to faltering consumer confidence.

But some took solace in a Conference Board survey that found confidence returning recently after tumbling immediately after the outbreak of the Persian Gulf war to its lowest level in 10 years.

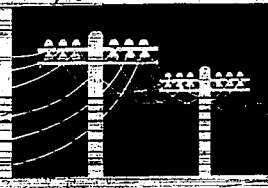

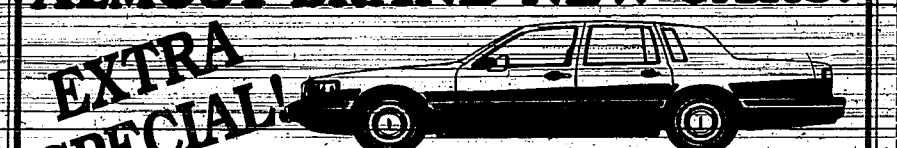

Boise law firm sued by EPA for removing office asbestos

BOISE - The Environmental Protection Agency has filed suit against Jerry Geicoechea and a construction company he hired, alleging they violated Clean Air Act regulations in removing asbestos during renovation of the Geicoechea Law Offices in Boise three years ago.

Outcochea also filed an office in Twin Falls, but it was not named in the EPA suit.

According to the complaint, filed Tuesday in U.S. District Court in Boise, some potentially cancer-causing asbestos fibers were released into the air while insulating material was removed from the building of the law offices in January 1988. But Geicoechea said Thursday that he didn't even suspect asbestos was used for insulation on basement pipes in his office building until after work had already begun.

Roommates face theft charges after they go on buying spree

TWIN FALLS - A Wednesday shopping spree ended with felony grand theft charges being filed against two Twin Falls women.

Committee passes 'feel good' bill for libraries

BOISE - The House Education Committee Thursday passed a bill that would create a library improvement account to help under-funded rural libraries.

The bill will likely pass, but finding money for the fund is another question, said Rep. Doug Jones, R-Eiler, and vice chairman of the committee.

"This is a feel-good bill," he said.

The bill's sponsor, Rep. Freeman Duncan, R-Coeur d'Alene, said supporters are "pragmatic" and know money is tight.

"The bill," one of a handful before the

Legislature relating to libraries would create an account for surplus money available at the end of the session, and allow libraries to request it through a general appropriation. The Idaho State Library would administer funds.

Idaho is one of six states that do not support local public libraries. Instead, libraries rely primarily on property taxes.

In rural Idaho, a third of the population doesn't have access to library services, speakers said. Statewide, 15 percent of libraries are unimproved, James Weatherly, director of public affairs at Boise State University, told the committee.

Speakers stressed the need for modern li-

brary services to prepare Idahoans for the information age, and said the state needs to make it happen.

Idahoans must make a more visible commitment to student education and to open kids' eyes," said Lynn Baird, president of the Idaho Library Association.

Anna Lou Posey, the Kimberly librarian, said state money would be great, but said her library meets the needs of those it serves.

"You need to look at it all that is needed in a town such as this," she said.

The director of the Twin Falls library, Arlyn Call, said the library runs on a \$569,358 budget, of which \$423,000

comes from the city and the rest in grants and in-house revenues.

"We're doing as well as we can without state money," Call said.

Around-Twin Falls County, Bull, Eiler, Kimberly and Hunsake have libraries. People who live outside those areas can buy non-resident library cards, Call said. The Twin Falls library serves 296 families, which pay \$60 a year for service.

Jones said state dollars could improve the Twin Falls interlibrary exchange or fund a bookmobile to serve outlying areas.

Posey said she would use any additional state money to replace outdated reference books.

House limits contributions to elections

BOISE - Rep. Jim Stoicheff has prodded the Idaho Legislature into taking the first step toward curbing the soaring cost of running for political office.

After a debate and fairly close ballot on whether to sidestep the bill - for amendments, the House voted 77-6 Thursday for Stoicheff's bill, which limits contributions to Idaho elections. The bill now goes to the Senate.

"This bill is not really going to stop large political action committees from breaking up into smaller 'PACs,'" said Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, referring to the Idaho Education Association. "But it's a beginning. It is something that needs to be done."

"We all realize that, especially after the last election."

Stoicheff, a Sandpoint Democrat, said the costs of legislative campaigns in Idaho have tripled during the past 10 years.

The time is now to prevent further intrusions into our race simply by the large infusion of money," he said.

The bill limits to \$1,000 individual or group contributions to candidates for legislative and city or county office. For certain candidates, the limit is \$5,000. Federal laws govern contributions to congressional candidates.

The debate over Stoicheff's bill wasn't over the goal of limiting campaign contributions, but whether there should be separate limits for primary and general elections.

A motion to put the bill up for amendment lost 45-36.

FAA answer soon on airport

HAILEY - Blaine County Airport Commissioners have one week to decide whether they will keep Friedman Memorial Airport in operation or pursue another location for the airport.

But their decision will not preclude an option of relocation at some point down the road.

The Federal Aviation Administration is pressuring the commission for a response to two options presented in a recently completed Airport Feasibility Study funded by an FAA grant.

The commission must decide whether it will continue development of Friedman or meet FAA design standards, or relocate immediately to an alternative site identified in the study as Moonstone near the border of Camas and Blaine counties.

"If we want to use funding available to us this year, we have to act," advised Airport Manager Todd Wirthlin.

Airport consultant Craig Campbell agreed with Wirthlin. He said a short-term solution is to continue Friedman airport operations at Friedman would allow the FAA to close out its books on the two-year feasibility study grant, but would not eliminate the possibility of being able to go back to the FAA in six months and request further study of the Moonstone site.

State board wants lawmakers to protect Middle Fork of river

BOISE - The Idaho Health and Welfare Board voted Thursday to recommend the state's highest level of protection for the Middle Fork of the Snake River.

Acting on a petition by the Idaho Conservation League, the board will pass along its recommendation to the Legislature to designate the river and 27 of its tributaries as "Outstanding Resource Water."

The state limit the ORW designation means human activities will not be allowed in the area if they lower long-term water quality.

"It was the right decision," said Will Whelan, the league's policy analyst. "I recommend the board making its decision based on the facts. I hope the Legislature does the same."

In setting up the ORW system, the Legislature's intent is to include protection for streams of outstanding water quality. The ICL filed its petition primarily on biological grounds. Whelan said the Middle Fork and many of its tributaries are important spawning and rearing habitat for chinook salmon, a trout the species proposed for inclusion on the federal endangered species list.

But Luke Russell, representing the Idaho Mining Association, told the board the conservation league's petition went beyond the legislative intent of the ORW designation by nominating an entire watershed.

Whelan countered that the ICL petition does not include the entire watershed, but only the most important spawning and rearing areas.

"We did not nominate the watershed," he said. "We nominated the most important segments."

Some of the streams not included in the petition include spawning and rearing habitat, he said.

The board wavered in its deliberation on the issue.

"First, I thought it was too much too soon," said board member Ronald Harlow

of Lewiston. "But now I think we can make it work."

Two members weren't so sure.

Dr. Fred Marcum of Sandpoint feared the designation was too ambitious and wouldn't make it through the Legislature.

"I'm afraid they'll reject the whole thing out of hand," he said.

Board Chairman David Mead of Twin Falls echoed his fears.

"By including the river and all 27 nominated tributaries, we're lessening the chances of having an ORW designation on the books," Mead said.

Mead and Marcum did not oppose the entire ORW designation, but favored a designation including fewer tributaries.

Joe Nagel, director of the Division of Environmental Quality of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, said he was surprised by the board's decision.

Under the designation, he said, existing activities would be allowed to continue if they included operations designed to reduce pollution. New operations would be permitted if plans included such practices and are approved by DEQ, Nagel said.

Operations would be shut down only if they present an imminent threat to water quality, he said.

Russell said the decision was troubling because of the precedent it would set for what can be designated an ORW. But the regulatory framework crafted by the DEQ may be workable, he said.

Whether or not mining could be profitable under the stringent conditions of the ORW designation, he was not certain. That depends in large part on the price of the material mined, he said.

The board rejected a petition to designate French Creek, north of McCall, as an ORW. Idaho chose not to designate Priest Lake, but to recommend the Legislature establish a water quality management plan for the reservoir, mainly to take whatever management would adequately protect the lake's clean water.

Centennial park committee member says vote is 'insane'

TWIN FALLS - The Centennial Waterfront Park Steering Committee's recommendation for a speed limit and no jet skiing in the area is "insane," a member of the group said Thursday.

If committee member Gary Olfelt's action indicates how other powerboaters

feel controversy surrounding a park plan for the 2-mile stretch of the Snake River, said the citizen panel was backed with people who from the start did not want water skiing or powerboating on the Snake from Perrine Bridge to Pillar Falls.

But other committee members said the recommendations for a speed limit and no jet skiing were fair and in keeping

with what they perceive as Twin Falls County's need for a quiet park on the river.

Olfelt, who owns Century Boat Yard, said the citizen panel was backed with people who from the start did not want water skiing or powerboating on the Snake from Perrine Bridge to Pillar Falls.

But committee Chairman Blaine Billman said he thinks the recommendations should be made from all sides of the issue.

By restricting the speed limit instead of engine size or types of powerboats allowed on the river, the county might be able to keep a \$57,000 state grant to build parking lot, rest rooms, boat ramp and docks for the park.

The grant money comes from gasoline taxes paid by recreational motorboaters. If the county could treat the people from

the park, the state Parks and Recreation Department could yank the grant.

The county has other grant money available. State funds for the waterways Commission and \$15,000 from the state Fish and Game Department.

If the county loses the \$57,000 grant, those other funds could disappear, too. Twin Falls County Commissioner Marvin Hempleman said Thursday.

But Billman said he did not want the panel to consider the grant money in selecting a park plan.

such places for "quiet users," said Billman.

But there are numerous places on the river where powerboaters cannot go because of rocks, Oliver said.

The river just below the area proposed for Centennial Park is an example of a place where canoeists can go and powerboaters cannot, he said.

But Billman who comes and motor as a part owner of a small motorboat and other committee members rejected the idea that quiet places on the river should be restricted to areas where powerboaters cannot go just because of rocks or other obstacles in the water. That is why the committee recommended the speed limit and exclusion of water-skiing and jet-skiing.

"With this format everyone has a place to go within 10 minutes of Twin Falls," Billman said.

He concluded by saying that the steering committee's recommendation differed completely from the

Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission's plan.

"They did not envision a quiet park at all," he said.

Committee member Mary McClellan, a member of the Twin Falls Rotary Club, said the recommendation was fair for everyone. McClellan neither canoes nor owns a motorboat but she considers herself a recreational boater.

The committee membership probably leaned toward a quiet approach to the park from the outset, he said.

But committee members tried to shove their findings as much a full recommendation, he said.

He said there were other reasons for excluding water skiers: the area is too narrow, has too many submerged hazards, such as rocks, and is not a long stretch of river.

But the recommendation might need some fine-tuning, he said.

"The 3 mph speed limit might be a little too low," McClellan said.

The County Commission will re-

view the recommendation and discuss it with the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission before deciding on a plan, Commissioner Hempleman said Thursday.

Commissioners will look closely at available grant money in deciding if they may not accept anything they're recommending," he said.

The commission could modify the recommendation or reject it outright and go with the Parks and Recreation Commission's original plan.

There will be no more public hearings on the issue. The commission will decide on a plan during one of its regular weekly meetings at the courthouse. Hempleman said he would make sure the meeting is open and publicized.

Billman said he will discuss the recommendation at Monday night's meeting of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission in the County Annex building. That meeting will be open to the public.

If the commission decides to pursue relocation, the FAA will provide funds necessary for development and maintenance projects to keep the airport "functioning safely and soundly," said FAA's Seattle Airport District Office in a letter to Wirthin.

The commission is faced with making a decision on whether, where and how to meet the transportation needs of the rapidly growing area around the airport.

The commission will study these two options and make a decision at its next meeting, Feb. 5.

In addition, a special citizens planning advisory committee submitted a list of five options the commission can review in its decision-making process.

The options will get aired in a public hearing tentatively scheduled for the evening of Feb. 20 at the Wood River High School. The commission has set a deadline and will make a final decision on these options before the end of the year.

The options ranged from keeping Blaine open indefinitely but restricting jet traffic to either a new airport site or Twin Falls, to upgrading Friedman to eliminate FAA design deviations, to completely re-

building the airport to a new location under a 20-year phased plan.

Brad Steiner, a member of the advisory committee, said in a letter to the commission that the two options represented the concerns of the various groups that have been asked to represent the needs of the people of Blaine County and to neither favor nor shun any one advocacy more than another," he wrote.

While the committee could not agree on any one solution to the problem, it did agree that one recommendation - lengthening the runway south into the Eccles' ranch presented in the feasibility study is inappropriate.

Campbell said looking at an alternative site is a long-term prospect one that would not be achieved in less than five years.

"Moonstone, in any scenario, is going to take five to 20 years to complete," he said.

Idaho ranks 18th nationally in survey of child well-being

WASHINGTON — A new study ranks Idaho 18th among the 50 states and the District of Columbia in eight measurements of child well-being.

The 1991 Kids Count Data Book was being unveiled today in Washington D.C. by the Center for the Study of Social Policy, a not-for-

profit research group founded 40 years ago. Among its findings was that Idaho ranked 18th among the 50 states and the District of Columbia in eight measurements of child well-being.

The infant mortality rate improved by 10 percent to 8.8 per 1,000 live births, leaving Idaho ranked 16th na-

tionally. The national average in 1988, the latest year for which statistics were available, was 10 per 1,000.

And even though Idaho ranked only 44th in child death rate in 1988 at 39.7 per 100,000 children through-

ly, there was a 22 percent drop between 1980 and 1988, more than double the national decline.

The state ranked 47th, and the rate increased 12 percent between 1984 and 1988 based on the number of

children who died by accident, suicide or murder. The national average was 69.7 per 100,000.

Roseanne Hardin, acting deputy administrator of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, Division of Family and Children's Services, said the relatively high suicide rate throughout the West probably had an impact on the state's ranking.

study was a rise in the number of teen out-of-wedlock births between 1980 and 1988. They increased 45 percent, more than four times faster

than the national increase. But Idaho still had one of the nation's lowest rates at 5.3 percent, ranked fourth in 1988.

Disney's 'White Fang' a pleasant family film

"White Fang," said to be "the first full-length motion picture to be filmed entirely on location in Alaska," has a lot going for it, the locale for one. It also includes some spectacular animal footage and several very engaging performances.

Another nice thing about it is that it doesn't give the villains too much screen time. They are dispatched in record time, and that's always a blessing. This sort of thing can become tiresome.

"White Fang," directed by Randall Kleiser, is based on the book written by Jack London. The principal character is a young adventurer who heads for Alaska, where he hopes to find the mine his father worked before his death.

The boy, engagingly played by Ethan Hawke ("Dead Poets Society"), finds the mine with the help of a kindly prospector, played by Klaus Maria Brandauer, who is convincing enough to make us believe that this is a truly gentle man.

"White Fang" has been released by Walt Disney Pictures, another subsidiary of the Disney factory. They created their Touchstone Pictures to release adult films without having them tarnish the Disney family image. Their Touchstone Pictures will apparently be used to release films that are for the new nuclear family, the family that has been raised on television and cassette, and is ready to accept more adult material than the family units of say, 20 years ago.

"White Fang" has its ugly moments, but it includes nothing chil-

dren haven't seen on television. The plot has the young man adopt an animal that is half wolf and half dog. The animal, however, is stolen by a bounty hunter (James Remar), who makes a fighter out of him. The dog-wolf becomes a participant in dog fights that are staged in enclosures ringed by bettors.

We see a number of these fights, but they are handled so nicely, and it will probably be apparent to most children that these animals have been trained to look as though they are fighting but may actually be playing with each other.

The film also includes an off-screen scene in which wolves attack and kill a man, but the producers are quick to remind us that this is a tale of fiction and that there has never been a documented case of a healthy wolf or pack of wolves attacking a human in North America.

"White Fang," which could be subtitled "A Boy and His Wolf," ends on a very pleasant note, and that's very nice. This is, all in all, a rather nice film that pleases both the eye and the heart.

Miniseries focuses on Custer, 1800s and the historic Plains Indian wars

George Armstrong Custer is one of the most controversial figures in American history.

A man of peerless bravery and amazing shortsightedness, his life and death have been the subjects of countless second-guessing.

On Sunday and Monday, Feb. 3 and 4, ABC airs "Son of the Morning Star," a four-hour miniseries that focuses on Custer's role in the Plains Indian wars of the mid- to late 1800s. Based on Evan S. Connell's best-selling book, the production, which was shot entirely on location in Montana, stars Gary Cole (of NBC's "Midnight Caller") as Custer and Rosanna Arquette as his worshipping wife, Libby. It also stars Deah Stockwell, Rodney A. Grant, David Strathairn and Michael Medeiros.

After graduating last in his class at West Point, Custer distinguished himself as a Union cavalry officer during the Civil War and was awarded the battlefield rank of general.

After the war, Custer was sent to the frontier, where he eventually took command of the Seventh Cavalry and became a major figure in the U.S. Army's brutal post-Civil War campaign against the Plains Indians. His aggressive Indian-fighting tactics horrified some back East, but they were successful in advancing the Army's goal of breaking Indian power in the Plains, and they earned him the hatred of many of the Plains tribes.

On June 25, 1876, the Indians got their revenge. Barely more than a

week before the United States celebrated its centennial, a proud, arrogant and overconfident George Custer and the 220 or so men with him (the exact number has never been definitively established) were annihilated when they attacked a vastly superior number of Sioux and Cheyenne warriors camped along the Little Big Horn River in south-east Montana.

The battle was a great triumph for the Indians, but it hastened their ultimate defeat. The news of Custer's disaster reached the East amid the centennial celebrations, and Custer instantly became a hero.

The national mood of righteous indignation called for swift and decisive retribution, and over the course of the next decade Indian power was broken forever.

Custer scholars may find "Son of the Morning Star" unfulfilling. Its

focus on the relationship between George and Libby Custer is a distracting departure from Connell's outstanding book. While understanding the full scope of their devotion to one another is an important part of unraveling who Custer was, in the end, the miniseries' preoccupation with it is a time-consuming dalliance.

"Son of the Morning Star" does a good job of re-creating its time and place, but it fails to evoke their spirit.

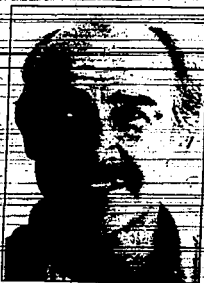

A: It's true that Sean was one of the first tax-emigres from the United Kingdom. He lived in Monte Carlo, a famed tax haven, for a while. Even in a short scene we look for a conflict, something dynamic," Edward Scott, producer-director of daytime's number one soap, "The Young and the Restless," explains. "You can always find a point of conflict between two people if you try."

That isn't the sole reason for "The Young and the Restless" lording it over the pack in the daytime ratings, but it's a clue. Scott apologizes for offering old clichés about the show's success — good stories, good actors, great performances — and boss Bill Bell.

But how else do you explain why "Y&R" is so durable?

"People like our characters," adds Scott. "We keep them around."

One person Scott won't can is wife Melody Thomas, known as the insecure Nikki, currently hiding pain and barely getting away with it.

Nikki always has a strong storyline because fans want it. Husband has no say here.

He goes with the tide, keeping a star, who happens to be his wife, happy on the set.

That's another clue to "Y&R" success. Management knows how to handle the talent. Edward Scott, who could pass for a tough auto dealer, a man's man, has spent 15 years on the soap stages at CBS.

His predecessor, Wesley Kenney, a fellow who looked like a plumber not some wispy actor, was known in the trade for supporting a performer, listening to his problems, finding answers.

Kenney instilled confidence, never tearing down. Scott got the picture.

When Gloria Monty hired Kenney to replace her as "General Hospital" boss, Edward Scott took over at "Y&R" and kept the support system going. Never was a transition so easy on actors.

Scott laughs at his reputation for support, finding answers. "I've always been political, running for class president in school while playing football and baseball. I had a father, a Texan, who got into everything.

Dad even had a yacht dealership at one time. I was going to be a doctor, but lousy grades in chemistry

Scott acquired culture as unit manager, and then shifted to CBS daytime programming.

ABC wins week with Super Bowl fun but ratings lower than most past bowls

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Super Bowl XXV was a ratings winner for the week for ABC, but still one of the least popular Super Bowls.

The Buffalo Bills' one-point loss to the New York Giants on Sunday was the most watched show on television last week. ABC's pre-game and post-game coverage ranked second and third, respectively.

But of all the Super Bowls, the 1991 game ranked 17th in television ratings popularity.

The 28-19 game earned a 41.8 average, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

The highest rated NFL championship game was 1982's Super Bowl XVI, when the San Francisco 49ers beat the Cincinnati Bengals 26-21 and captured a 49.1 average for CBS.

Overall network ratings showed ABC far and away the No. 1 network for the week with a 15.6 average. CBS was a distant second with 12.1 and the usually first-place NBC was third with 11.6.

Third time may be charm for 'Love'

LOS ANGELES — During its first season, "Anything But Love," although a good series, was anything but perfect. The favorable reviews were loaded with those familiar room-for-improvement qualifiers.

In the ABC comedy's second season, the critics cheerfully reported that "Anything But Love" had improved. Yes, a good series had become very good.

Co-stars Jamie Lee Curtis ("A Fish Called Wanda") and angst-ridden comedian Richard Lewis believed they had done everything the network asked of them. Fans left Chicago magazine writers Marty Gold (Lewis) and Hannah Miller (Curtis) about to admit they were in love. Yet, despite the critical acclaim and the cast's confidence, "Anything But Love" did not make ABC's fall 1990 lineup.

"When we finished the 22 episodes last year and felt really good about them," Curtis told TV critics, "we were really excited about the way that we ended the show. I was very surprised when I first heard that they (ABC programmers) had decided not to go back with the characters and see what happened to Hannah and Marty afterward."

"Obviously, it'd be crazy to say I wasn't very disappointed. I mean, I was very, very disappointed. I cry and I thought, 'What a real shame. We're finally getting the show to where it was really quite wonderful.'"

Subjected to another round of fine-tuning, "Anything But Love" will get the 9:30-10 p.m. Eastern time-Wednesday time slot starting Feb. 6 (replacing Jay Thomas' "Married People"). In the third-

season premiere, Hannah and Marty agree that it's time to act on their emotions. Detours, however, will keep them out of the bedroom until the end of the third episode.

John Ritter ("Three's Company," "Hooperman") will appear in the first three episodes as a dashing photojournalist attracted to Hannah. But the major cast change is the addition of Bruce Weitz, who won an Emmy for playing the growling barker on "Hill Street Blues." Weitz portrays the meat-and-potatoes columnist Mike Urbanek.

Several critics ("Cheers" and "Moonlighting") stumbled after allowing their lead character to develop a romantic relationship. Will the admission of romance destroy "Anything But Love," will they or won't they lens? "They apparently never saw the make love before," Lewis joked.

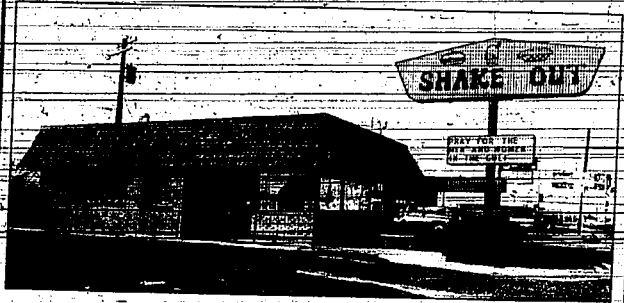
