Hot waste will stay in Colorado

TWIN FALLS — A Colorado utility has put on hold its plans to ship highly radioactive spent reactor fuel to Idaho for storage.

"We are not going to ship to Idaho for storage," said Kim DeVeigil, spokeswoman for Public Service Co. of Colorado.

The first of 247 shipments was to have arrived in Idaho Sunday on Public Service Co. trucks, and likely would have met a state police blockade at the border.

The company and the federal Energy Department had planned to ship about 5,000 cubic feet of highly radioactive spent reactor fuel from the Fort St. Vrain reactor in Platteville, Colo., to DOE's Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

IRA mortar shell misses top Britons

LONDON — Prime Minister John Major and Britain's war Cabinet narrowly escaped injury Thursday when a mortar shell fired from a nearby urban explosion in the backyard of his official Downing Street residence.

It fell just 40 feet from the room where he and his senior Cabinet colleagues were meeting.

The attack, which took place in the midst of one of the highest security alerts in British history because of the Persian Gulf War, was carried out by the Irish Republican Army and had no direct link to the conflict. It was launched from Whitehall, the main artery of central London's government. It shot and one of the city's most heavily guarded areas.

Security experts said they believed the IRA may have tried to capture world attention already heightened by the war. But the organization, which claimed responsibility for the attack in a statement Thursday night, said it had been planned long before the conflict and before Major took office last November.

The explosion shattered bombproof windows in the ground-floor room where Major and other officials were meeting but injured none of them. "We were sitting in the Cabinet Room when the windows came in," a breathless Foreign Secretary Douglas Hurd told reporters afterward.

Wisconsin's guns join bombardment

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia — In endless hours of air strikes, U.S. and allied planes rocked Baghdad, key bridges and the bunkers of front-line troops Thursday, and blew two more Iraqi "getaway jets" out of the sky.

A second veteran U.S. battleship joined the bombardment of Iraq's Kuwaiti coastline. The pounding was having an impact. Returning pilots told of a devastated landscape in Kuwait, and journalists near the border found first-hand evidence.

Four Iraqi soldiers who turned themselves in muttering over and over about the "bombing... bombing... bombing."

But Desert Storm losses mounted, too. A U.S. Navy FA-18 Hornet fighter went down in the northern Persian Gulf, apparently not from hostile fire, and an Army helicopter crashed in Saudi Arabia.

The Navy pilot was missing; one soldier was killed and four were injured in the helicopter crash.

President Bush's two top war advisers

Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and joint chief of staff Gen. Colin Powell

went to the Gulf to confer over the weekend with local commanders on the countdown to a ground offensive, a momentous clash between a half-million

Prime targets tough to locate

AT A U.S. AIR BASE IN CENTRAL BASE (AP) — After a three-week air war against Iraq and Kuwait, U.S. pilots said Thursday they are finding it increasingly difficult to locate prime targets.

Much of Iraq's armor remains hidden in bunkers and Iraqi ground forces are using decoys to fool allied pilots, said the commander at the largest U.S. Air Force Base in Saudi Arabia.

"We have fewer targets than we did when we started," said Col. Hal Homburg, 45, of Dallas, commander of the 4th Tactical Fighter Wing Provisional, Homburg, a

n F-15E Eagle pilot, has flown a number of night missions against Iraqi targets.

The wing flight commander, Col. Steve Plummer, who flies F-16A Fighting Falcon, said it was still easy to find targets, but "finding the kinds of targets we want is becoming more difficult."

Iraqi President Saddam Hussein has buried most of his armor "making it difficult for us to locate it," said Plummer, 45, of Earle, Ark.

"He dug in very well. The majority of his armor is dug in and concealed. He moves it as little as possible because he puts it in danger when he moves it," said Plum-

mer.

February heat wave in East fluke, not climate shift

WASHINGTON — The record-setting winter heat wave in the East this week is the consequence of a fluke in weather patterns and not new, direct evidence of global warming, meteorologists said.

"Regional temperature fluctuations are much larger than global warming at this time. Therefore you shouldn't blame a temporary weather fluctuation on the greenhouse effect," said James Hansen of the Goddard Institute for Space Studies in

New York, a leading researcher into global warming.

"I wouldn't blame the warmth of the last few days on global warming. That's going too far," said Douglas Le Comte, managing editor of the Agriculture Department's Weekly Weather and Crop Bulletin.

"It is very much an April-like pattern that has temporarily taken over," said Richard J. Tinker of the National Oceanic and

Atmospheric Administration's Climate Analysis Center in Camp Springs, Md.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, the 70-degree readings in Washington broke or tied the city's record for those dates. The 68-degree record for Feb. 4 was set back in 1983, while the record tied on Wednesday was set in 1920.

Other cities all along the East Coast saw record highs for February.

The nearly tropical conditions coincided with the gathering, in nearby Chantilly, Va., of representatives of 135 nations to

work toward a treaty on steps to combat global warming.

There is division within the scientific community over the extent, and indeed the existence, of global warming. But many scientists agree the Earth is gradually being victimized by the greenhouse effect, which refers to the phenomenon of certain atmospheric gases trapping heat on and around a planet.

The problem is exacerbated, scientists say, by a number of pollutants, including methane.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 67 degrees at Hagerman. Stanley reported the coldest at 27 degrees below zero.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the highest temperature was 89 degrees at Borrego Springs, Calif. The lowest was 5 degrees below zero at Craig, Colo.

Week of warm weather begins to wane with rain

Rain was scattered over a large part of the East on Thursday as a weakening winter wave began to cool somewhat although several upper Midwest cities still reported record highs.

At midday, rain fell over the eastern Carolinas, northern Tennessee, eastern Kentucky, western Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, New Jersey, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and a large section of New York state.

More than an inch of rain fell from Wednesday afternoon into Thursday morning across sections of southern Ohio. Rain over southern and central New England changed to snow over central and northern Maine.

The heaviest snowfall during the six hours up to 1 p.m. EST included 2 inches at Caribou, Maine, and 1 inch at Augusta, Augusta, Maine.

Elsewhere, rain fell over the northern coast of Washington state.

Record high temperatures for the date included 49 degrees at Lake Mead, Nev., 48 at Grand Rapids, Mich., 48 at Grand Rapids, Mich., 46 at Marquette, Mich., 45 at Klamath Falls, Ore., and 46 at Williston, N.D.

At the opposite extreme, Kodiak, Alaska, chilled to record-tying low of 2 below zero.

Senate Ethics Committee divided over treatment for Keating 5

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate Ethics Committee is caught in a partisan split over how to treat four of the five senators who intervened with their regulators on behalf of political donor and S&L operator Charles I. Keating Jr., congressional sources said Thursday night.

The three Republicans on the six-member committee favor dismissing Sen. John Glenn, D-Ore., and John McCain, R-Ariz., from the case, the sources said. This was a proposal made last September by committee special counsel Robert S. Bennett, who reportedly told the committee there wasn't any evidence that Glenn and McCain broke any rules.

But the senators who declined the split on condition of anonymity, said the three Democrats want basically the same treatment for Glenn, McCain and Sens. Dennis DeConcini, D-Ariz., and Donald W. Riegle Jr., D-Mich.

President Hashemi Rafsanjani to discuss the Iranian leader's offer to mediate between Iraqi President Saddam Hussein and the international alliance arrayed against him. A Soviet envoy also was to meet with Iranian officials.

The Bush administration says there is nothing to mediate. Saddam must simply announce a withdrawal from Kuwait.

But Saddam showed no signs of surrender. Iraq launched one of its largely ineffective Scud missiles early Friday at Riyadh. Like an estimated 17 others fired previously at the Saudi capital, it was intercepted by a U.S. Patriot missile. The wreckage landed in a parking lot and caused no injuries or major damage, witnesses said.

Attired warplanes battered Baghdad for 7 hours from Wednesday night to Thursday morning. Associated Press correspondent Saeed Nasrwi reported from the Iraqi capital.

He said at least 10 homes were destroyed or heavily damaged, and local authorities said 22 civilians were killed.

Ramsey Clark, the former U.S. attorney general and peace-activist who is in Baghdad this week, told reporters that residential damage reported by the U.S. sir exceeded the mandate of U.N. Security Council Resolution 678, which authorized the use of force to expel Iraq from Kuwait.

"You don't have to bomb cities. It has nothing to do with Resolution 678," he said.

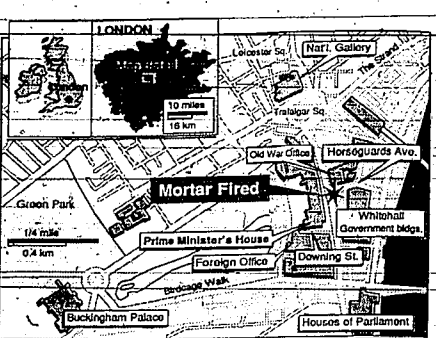
Clark said he visited the heavily bombed southern port city of Basra and described what he saw as "a human and civilian tragedy," including bombing of hospitals and other non-military sites.

He said a Baghdad doctor spoke of several thousand deaths or injuries from allied air strikes. Iraqi authorities have reported more than 400 civilian deaths.

Asked about Clark's statements about civilian casualties at a news briefing in Riyadh, a U.S. spokesman, Marine Brig. Gen. Richard I. Neal, said: "War is a dirty business, and unfortunately there will be collateral damage."

He used the military euphemism for civilian casualties.

Earlier, U.S. military officials said Iraqi troops were moving anti-aircraft guns into civilian neighborhoods in Baghdad and Kuwait City to protect them from allied strikes. None have been attacked thus far, but the matter is under study, the officials said.

Officials said Major coolly told colleagues, "I think we had better start again somewhere else" and adjourned the meeting to an underground conference room.

Major later told the House of Commons it was clear from the timing of the attack that it was a deliberate attempt both to kill the Cabinet and to do damage to our democratic government."

The assault was the IRA's first attempt to assassinate a British prime minister since it came within inches of killing Margaret Thatcher, Major's predecessor, in a bomb attack on a hotel in Brighton in October 1984. It led to immediate calls for increased security measures from members of Parliament, many of whom heard the explosions from their front-row box seats.

The attack took place shortly after 10 a.m. when a white van pulled up at the corner of Whitehall and Horseguards Avenue, about 200 yards north of Downing Street. One by one, witnesses said, three mortar shells were fired through the roof of the van, after which the vehicle burst into flames.

None of the witnesses who spoke to reporters recalled seeing anyone fleeing the van, although police said later a man had escaped on the back of a motorcycle driven by another man. They said the man took advantage of cold temperatures and a thick snowfall, unusual for this region, which kept Whitehall relatively empty of cars and pedestrians and hindered visibility.

Two of the shells overshot Downing Street and landed harmlessly in an open lawn west of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, which includes Downing Street. But the third exploded in the walled rear garden of No. 10, the prime minister's office and official residence. Inside, Major was holding his daily session with the war Cabinet, which includes Home Secretary Douglas Hogg, Defense Secretary Norman Lamont, Defense Secretary Tom King and other senior officials.

The explosion shattered windows and scorched the outside wall of the building, along with Lamont's official residence at No. 11 and chief whip Richard Ryder's office at No. 12.

Simpson lambasts war coverage

WASHINGTON (AP) - Assistant-Senate-Republican leader Alan Simpson charged Tuesday that journalists covering the Persian Gulf War from inside Iraq pose a "great distraction" for allied military leaders.

Simpson also said CNN correspondent Katie Couric was a "sympathizer" with Iraqi President

Saddam Hussein's cause.

"We should spend our time trying to protect people who are there at the invitation of an enemy government," Simpson said.

He used a luncheon meeting with reporters to accuse Western news organizations of playing into the hands of Iraqi propagandists.

sites were built more than 30 years ago "to meet standards and regulations very different and less stringent than those today."

The study includes options ranging from no action to a sweeping reconfiguration of the production complex, known as Complex-21 - in some Idaho circles that means the term "Coke."

"Option B," the most ambitious and widely favored alternative being considered, would reduce the number of nuclear weapons facilities from the current 13 to no more than six.

Three major nuclear material production and manufacturing sites would be consolidated into one. The plant at Rocky Flats, Colo., would be shut down and its operations

consolidated with those at Oak Ridge, Tenn., and Amarillo, Texas, at a location yet to be determined.

Major said scenario INEL is one of the possible sites that could become the centerpiece of the department's modernized nuclear weapons production facilities. It would "combine the plutonium triage production at Rocky Flats, uranium and lithium fabrication at Oak Ridge and final weapons assembly now in Amarillo."

In addition to considering INEL and other existing sites for new facilities, the department seeks federal agencies and states to submit offers of sites of 5,000 acres to the department for the consolidated plant.

"Never let it be said that the Department of Energy doesn't have a sense of humor," said Jerry Cooke, executive director of the Snake River Alliance, an Idaho nuclear non-proliferation group.

But the department's plans are still vague.

"The very carefully-drawn-out way much that lots of us know what the Department of Energy has planned for INEL," Cooke said.

The consolidation is expected to

take as long as 20 years to complete and cost from \$6.7 billion to \$15 billion, officials said.

Public hearings on an environmental impact statement for the proposal are scheduled to begin in April, but Cooke said the study should include cleanup, waste management and bomb plant modernization - including the proposed New Production Reactor - in a single document.

The plan's environmental assessment is expected to take until late 1993, but it won't include the location of the NPR - a decision that will be crucial to the reconfiguration, Cooke said.

"It's probably the most important decision right now being made by the Department of Energy," she said, "leaving it outside the scope of the modernization skews the whole process."

"I'm not kidding anyone who wants INEL to be, who doesn't know are the people of Idaho," Cooke said. "I think the Department of Energy is deliberately compromising this process that had the promise of actually being a comprehensive study."

the department and Public Service Co. to accept the spent fuel for storage.

In that contract, the energy department agreed to accept eight spent fuel segments, each consisting of 240 fuel blocks.

Between 1980 and 1987 three segments - about 2,300 cubic feet of spent fuel - were sent to INEL's Idaho Chemical Processing Plant in IDAHO.

The spent fuel is stored in a facility designed specifically for graphite fuel blocks from high-temperature, gas-cooled reactors.

But the department doesn't have definite plans for the stored fuel.

INEL officials said last fall that the fuel could be reprocessed to recover still-usable nuclear fuel. Alternatively, it could be sent waste to a federal high-level waste repository where it opens up part of the land to be used for research in the development of a New Production Reactor proposed for construction at INEL.

Any such uses of the spent fuel, however, would require an

environmental review, they said.

No research has been done using the fuel already at INEL in the seven years it has been stored there.

But Watkins in his letter to Andrus said the spent fuel from the Colorado reactor will "ultimately" be part of research in reactor design and operation and waste-processing technology. INEL would be a candidate site for such research, he said.

The research program does not yet exist, but plans to study fuel performance and processing waste from a high-temperature, gas-cooled reactor are being formulated, Energy Department spokesman Fred Lash said.

Meanwhile, Public Service Co. on Monday broke ground on a contingency plan: a temporary spent-fuel-storage facility at the reactor site in Colorado. The spent fuel would be held in steel and concrete casks to await a solution to either the present stalemate or permanent nuclear waste disposal.

When to start ground war is next decision

WASHINGTON (AP) — With the aerial bombardment of Iraq and Kuwait in its fourth week, the allies are facing a critical decision: When to launch a ground attack.

Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and Gen. Colin Powell, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, are expected to assess the situation this weekend in a trip to Saudi Arabia.

Here are some questions, and answers focusing on the war so far and what may lie ahead.

Q. What destruction have missiles and bombs wrought on Iraqi forces?
 A. Allied fighters and bombers have damaged Iraq's supply routes to its troops in Kuwait and blown up some of their supplies. More than 200 Iraqi planes have either been destroyed or fled to Iran. Allied commanders say most of the tiny Iraqi navy has been knocked out.

Q. How badly has Iraq's elite Republican Guard been hurt by the round-the-clock bombing?

Airline pilot gets 1st air kill by an A-10 tank killer

AN AIRBASE IN EASTERN SAUDI-ARABIA (AP) — A reservist who flies jetliners for USAir became the first A-10 pilot to score an air-to-air kill with the tank-killer. Air Force officials said Thursday.

The Air Force also said a team of A-10s struck a dozen Iraqi missile-launching sites Wednesday night. Preliminary reports indicated several were destroyed and others heavily damaged.

The Air Force paid tribute to the A-10 in an odd way Thursday, displaying one that returned safely to base despite a gaping hole in its right wing.

The plane, after the butt of jokes because of its slowness and ugly design, has a series of redundant systems designed to allow it to fly even after being heavily damaged.

"He had to hold the control stick all the way to the left to keep it level," Tech. Sgt. Richard Gomez, 35, of Van Horn, Texas, said of the pilot who flew the damaged jet back from over Kuwait. "The plane worked as well as a killer, but it didn't come back."

The A-10, which first flew in 1975, is designed to fly slow and low for air-to-ground missions, primarily as a tank-killer, but also against missile sites and other ground targets.

The pilot credited with the air-to-air kill was Capt. Bob Swain, 33, of Charlotte, N.C.

Swain, who flies Boeing 767s for USAir, said he was on a mission over central Kuwait on Wednesday

A. The guard has suffered damage, but Pentagon sources say the 150,000-man force held in reserve remains effective and must be softened up before being a ground war begins. Hundreds of the force's tanks and artillery pieces have been hit. But the force is dispersed over hundreds of square miles and has had six months to beef up its supplies, say Pentagon officers.

Q. What did Iraq have arrayed against the allies at the start of the war?

A. Roughly 5,500 tanks, 4,000 artillery pieces, 8,000 pieces of anti-aircraft artillery and 555,000 dug-in troops. Iraq has poison gas capability, which it used in its eight-year war against Iran. The United States has more than 305,000 troops in the region, with an additional 205,000 troops from other countries in the coalition opposing Iraq.

Q. Would a ground war result in substantial casualties?

A. Allied commanders say their constant attacks of Saddam Hussein's Scud missile-launching sites have had an effect. Thirty-five SCUDs were fired in the first week of the war at Israel and Saudi Arabia, 18 in the second week and four in the third.

A. Unquestionably. Army figures show that more than 80 percent of all U.S. casualties in recent wars have been infantrymen. Secretary of State James A. Baker III said Wednesday that military operations necessarily involve "many casualties, great hardships." So far, U.S. casualties have numbered a dozen killed in action and two dozen missing in action.

Q. What would an allied ground offensive look like?

A. It would probably begin at night with a timed sequence of attacks across a broad front, military planners say. The United States would try to stop the Iraqis from fully retooling its frontline forces by using its advanced airborne radar to identify and track opposing aircraft and ground targets.

Q. What happened to the Scud war?

A. Allied commanders say their constant attacks of Saddam Hussein's Scud missile-launching sites have had an effect. Thirty-five SCUDs were fired in the first week of the war at Israel and Saudi Arabia, 18 in the second week and four in the third.

Q. Is diplomatic activity still under way in an attempt to stop the fighting?

A. Yes, but the United States says it will stay clear of diplomatic activity as long as Iraqi troops remain in Kuwait.

Iran, which hopes to play a pivotal role in a post-war Middle East, is the focal point for ceasefire efforts.

Senior Soviet and Turkish envoys met at length with the Iranian foreign minister on Iran's ideas for a diplomatic settlement.

Q. How much is known about Iraqi civilian casualties?

A. The Iraqis say 150 people were killed in an allied air raid on the town of Nassariyah this week.

An Iraqi newspaper says 349 people have been killed in Basra. Allied commanders acknowledge that civilian casualties are inevitable in what has become one of the largest air campaigns ever.

U.S. military sources suggested Thursday that Iraq is deliberately putting non-combatants in harm's way — by moving anti-aircraft guns into civilian neighborhoods in Baghdad and Kuwait City.

Here are developments in the Persian Gulf war:

- Iraq fired a long-range Scud missile at the Saudi capital early Friday but the projectile was destroyed by Patriot defense missiles in a spectacular flash over the city. It was the first Scud attack since Saturday.

- The allies pounded Baghdad with bombs and missiles for 12 hours overnight. Iraqi officials said Thursday the raids on Baghdad killed 22 civilians and injured many others.

- Two allied F-15s Thursday shot down two Iraqi planes fleeing to Iran. Marine Brig. Gen. Richard I. Neal said in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, two Iraqi Su-22s, and perhaps three, were shot down while flying to Iran.

- Iraq is moving anti-aircraft guns into civilian neighborhoods in Baghdad and Kuwait City to deter allied strikes against the defensive weapons. U.S. military officials said Thursday.

- The battleship USS Wisconsin fired 11 rounds Thursday from its 16-inch guns at targets in Kuwait.

Saudis seek hidden Iraqis in abandoned resort town

KHAFJI, Saudi Arabia — Saudi armored personnel carriers rolled through a deserted resort town in this abandoned frontier town Thursday, hunting for hidden Iraqi forces more than a week after the Gulf war began.

Conferees checked through empty streets as the Saudi forces, equipped with megaphones, moved from house to house and urged any remaining Iraqi soldiers to surrender. "Iraqi soldiers give up," a Saudi official said, shouting from a loudspeaker in front of a two-story luxury home. "Your Saudi brothers are outside. The Saudi authorities

will give you all the medicine and food you need. No harm will come to you. Please raise a white flag and come out."

More gunfire rang out, and military authorities at the scene said it was unclear whether the fire came from Iraq or Saudi weapons.

Sporadic Iraqi sniper fire has nagged the city throughout the past week as Saudi authorities combed their houses to house-searchers.

Saudi Lt. Col. Turki Firsi, commander of a mechanized brigade based at Khafji, said Saudi forces are still going house-to-house seeking remaining Iraqi holdouts.

"They are hiding in some places," he said. "We are searching ..."

American slain in terrorist attack

ADANA, Turkey (AP) — A U.S. civilian employed at an air base was gunned down Thursday, apparently becoming the first American killed by terrorists opposed to the war against Iraq.

Hours later, a bomb exploded outside a NATO Air Force command building in the Aegean port city of Izmir, shattering windows but causing no injuries, the state Anadolu news agency reported.

Babette Eugene Metzler, 44, of Detroit, was shot as she was getting ready to go to work.

Senators may lift fly new wing for air base

MOUNTAIN HOME—Local folks have been worried that there may be cutbacks or a closure of Mountain Home Air Force Base, but Idaho's senators say the Air Force has informed them of plans to station a new wing at the base.

Senators Steve Symms and Larry Craig met Thursday with Air Force Vice Chief of Staff Gen. Mike Loh and Deputy Assistant Secretary Gary Vest. Loh said the Air Force plans to form a new composite wing, and Mountain Home appears to be an ideal location.

Symms and Craig said they were advised at Thursday's meeting that the wing would include F-15 Eagle fighters, F-16 Fighting Falcons, E-3 Airborne Warning and Control (AWACS) aircraft and tankers. The mix also could include B-52 bombers.

Team rescues injured Halley youth from top of mountain

HAILEY—An 11-year-old Halley youth had to be rescued from the east side of Carbonate Ankle Wednesday night when a twisted ankle left him stranded.

Bo Bondar and two young friends were clamoring about on the mountain late Wednesday afternoon when the injury occurred, Michael Barto, Blaine County Search and Rescue commander, said.

The rescue team was called at about 5:30 p.m., but a steep slope and darkness prolonged the effort until about 9:30 p.m. when Bondar was finally taken to Blaine County Medical Center, Barto said. Bondar was treated and released from the hospital Thursday morning.

Twin Falls senator sponsors bill to improve day care

BOISE—Republican Sen. Joyce Meeks today announced he is sponsoring a bill to decrease the ratio of children to staff in day care centers and to require emergency training for day care operators.

The bill was introduced Thursday in the Senate Health and Welfare Committee.

The child-staff ratios would depend on the age of the children, but at most there would be 10 children to one staff person. Emergency training, such as CPR, would also be required of staff.

The legislation would affect centers that care for 13 or more children.

Last year, a measure to mandate emergency training for child care operators passed the Senate but failed in the House. Sen. Sue Reents, D-Boise, is sponsoring the bill with McRoberts.

Kimberly fire trucks may not leave city without permission

KIMBERLY—The City Council held a special meeting Tuesday night to reaffirm a city policy regarding fire trucks.

The policy states that city fire trucks are not allowed outside of the Kimberly city limits unless approval is given by the City Council or the mayor.

The policy needed to be reaffirmed according to city officials after city fire trucks were taken out of the city limits for a training session without permission. No other action was taken at the meeting.

Bill that would help historical society passes committee

BOISE—Legislation that would help the Jerome County Historical Society's museum project passed the House Revenue and Taxation Committee on Thursday.

The bill, sponsored by Rep. Steve Antonio, R-Rupert, and chairman of the committee, would require counties to levy property taxes for county museum boards and would make museum boards separate taxing units.

The Jerome County Historical Society currently can't get any county tax revenue for the agricultural museum it is building on U.S. Highway 93 just north of Interstate 84, but the legislation would change that.

War has roots in history

TWIN FALLS—Meddling foreign countries largely created the chaos in the Middle East and probably will have to step in again to try to undo the damage of the Persian Gulf War, a scholar in Midwest history said Thursday night.

TJ reports 71% plunge in earnings

BOISE—TJ International Inc. officials blamed weak housing markets for the company's 71 percent fourth-quarter decline in profits.

TJ International owns the Norco Windows Inc. factory in Twin Falls, where it builds wood windows for western U.S. markets. The plant has laid off 29 of its 87-worker force during the winter.

Thursday's report marked the Boise-based company's sixth consecutive quarter of earnings below year-earlier levels. And the first quarter of 1991 is expected to bring TJ International's first quarterly loss in 16 years, company officials said.

TJ International reported net income of \$566,000 for the three months ending Dec. 1, or 7 cents per share, compared with income of \$2 million, or 26 cents per share, for the same period of 1990.

Sales of its structural building materials and wood windows fell 23 percent in the fourth quarter, to \$65 million from \$84 million a year earlier.

Wall Street's TJ International president and chief executive officer, said that 1991 markets are not expected to improve much.

He said the company anticipates posting a loss in its traditionally slower first quarter — its first quarterly loss since 1975.

Magic Valley legislators working to improve rural health care

BOISE—Two measures to improve rural health care were introduced Thursday in the Senate Health and Welfare Committee.

One would provide state funds to start up rural health clinics.

The second would establish a loan repayment program in which the state would repay student loans in exchange for health care professionals working for a few years in Idaho.

All three Magic Valley senators on the committee—Sen. Denton Darrington, R-Deslo, Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, and Russ Newcomb, R-Twin Falls—voted against creating a rural health care commission to oversee the start-up of rural clinics.

"You have to prioritize your money in this state right now," Newcomb said.

He said he would prefer increasing the number of seats for Idaho students at the University of Washington's medical school and establishing a loan repayment program.

McRoberts said she was concerned that the state would continue to fund the best clinics indefinitely.

"If the state determines a clinic is needed in Clayton, in Custer County, for example, she said, "I don't know if that community can support and fund a clinic."

The legislation, sponsored by Sen. Tim

Tucker, D-Porthill, was introduced by a 6-4 vote. If passed, a Rural Health Care Commission would be formed, consisting of members of Idaho's seven district health boards.

The commission would dispense up to \$50,000 in start-up money for each new rural clinic.

Communities would have to match the grant by 10 percent, Tucker said.

The legislation calls for a \$2 million appropriation for the program.

The need for improved rural health care is great, Tucker told the committee.

Idaho has the lowest number of doctors per capita in the country, 1.3 for every 1,000 people, compared to 2.46 nationally, he said. And most work in urban areas.

Another component to improving rural health care is the loan repayment bill introduced with unanimous support.

Under the program, the state would repay up to \$20,000 a year in student loans for physicians, physicians' assistants and nurse practitioners while they work in underserved areas around the state.

Five people could participate a year, and the state and the professional would contract for a 2- to 4-year period.

A second version of the loan repayment legislation died on a tie vote along party lines — Democrats for Republicans against.

"I would have prohibited health care providers from denying service to indigent clients or those receiving Medicare

or Medicaid assistance. (Doctors) shouldn't exclude those who need health care the most," said Tucker, who presented the measure.

Newcomb, a surgeon, said he recognizes Tucker's concern but suggested a mandate might deter applicants to the loan repayment program who would fear repercussions for refusing to treat an indigent client for other reasons — he used the example of a doctor who has been working several days nonstop and is exhausted.

But Tucker said there are numerous deterrents to establishing a rural medical practice. That "may be one, but I wouldn't think it's a linchpin," he said.

Tom Machala, executive director of the Family Health Services clinics for low-income people in Twin Falls, Blain and Burley, said the legislative efforts are useful but not a panacea.

"The shortage of health care providers might make additional rural clinics difficult to sustain," Machala said.

"It'd be great to have the clinics but then where are you going to get the people?" he asked. "Quality of life only goes so far."

And Machala was skeptical that a loan repayment program would be an incentive for doctors to come to Idaho. Many states have similar programs, he said.

"It's not going to funnel a huge number of people into Idaho."

Legislators back Andrus' ban on waste shipments

TWIN FALLS—Sen. Steve Symms condemned Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus' vow to ban the shipment of radioactive waste from a Colorado nuclear power plant into Idaho, but legislators of both parties applauded the governor's action Thursday.

Symms, an Idaho Republican, said "you can sit down and work out a solution for the mutual benefit of your state and the USA or you can do like Gov. Andrus has chosen to do and demagogue the issue with no solution."

Andrus called Symms' statement "totally irresponsible," and invited the senator to compare records of accomplishments for the people of Idaho.

Sen. Symms has never been able to do liver for the people of Idaho," Andrus said.

Magic Valley legislators supported Andrus' pledge of resistance.

"I think it's an outrage. I certainly hope they don't force our hand," said Sen. John Peavey, D-Carey. Idaho should stand firm even if it means putting police forces on the Utah-Idaho border, he said.

Sen. J. aid Noh, R-Kimberly, agreed.

"The governor's right. Let's go into court and fight it out," Noh said. "If that doesn't work, I see nothing wrong with a confrontation," he added.

In October 1988, Andrus closed Idaho's borders to storage of nuclear waste generated in other states. Two years ago, he began

It won't be a drop in the bucket for Bliss water system

BLISS—The city needs about \$16,000 to repair and maintain its domestic water system — and slightly higher water bills may be the price residents here have to pay.

Newly appointed Mayor Sam Bishop was sworn in Wednesday following the surprise resignation last month of long-

time Mayor Roland Zollinger — told the council that Bliss would either have to get a loan or a grant to pay for repairs and lease payments on its water system.

The city will have a \$12,000 price tag to pay for the EPA upgrade, which will include a concrete collar around the well and a new floor.

In addition, the city will owe Union Pacific railroad \$2,300 for the lease of the domestic water pipes and the property sur-

rounding them in September.

The city currently owns a \$10,000 certificate of deposit, which it will use toward payment of pump repairs. Bishop told the council that he is looking into the possibility of a low-interest loan from the Idaho Department of Water Resources for the balance, which he estimated to be about \$6,000.

A letter read at the council meeting from James R. Schmidt of CHI in Boise said the pool is "as sound as any pool being built today."

The engineering firm surveyed the 41-year old pool, which had to be closed last August for repairs. Councilman Rocky Jackson reported bid prices would be available in a few weeks for resurfacing the pool, fixing or replacing the heat exchanger and filter and repair of the pool buildings.

Contractors from the local area have offered to construct new buildings at no cost except for materials, he said. Fencing materials have been donated also, he said.

"We're not talking for the \$85,000 price range now. With a little will power and help from the citizens, it (the pool) will go this summer," he said.

The Jerome City Council also received some kudos.

City Clerk Helen Paoli read a letter from the city of Castleford thanking Jerome for City Administrator Larry Paine's assistance in choosing an engineering firm to construct a new fire station.

"You are lucky to have him (Paine) on your team," the letter stated.

In other business, the council:

- Unanimously approved awarding a \$64,983 bid for a sewer jetter to Hirming GMC Truck Center of Pocatello.
- Six bids were received. The low bid of \$63,045.33 from Meridian Equipment was not accepted, however, because the bid proposal did not meet 11 aspects of the specifications.
- The city received a \$5,000 trade-in value for its 17-year-old sewer cleaning equipment.
- Awarded financing of the lease purchase of the sewer jetter to First Security Bank at an interest rate of 7.39 percent. Total net pay out for the sewer jetter, that increased residents' sewer bills by 5 percent, will be \$76,897.40, Paine said.

Popular Dinamation exhibit returns to ISU

POCATELLO — Parents who bring their children to the new Dinamation exhibit at the Idaho Museum of Natural History should be wary about matching wits with them.

It is likely the kids will demonstrate something their parents only vaguely know about their sophisticated dinosaur vocabulary.

"It's really interesting that many of these kids have built those very complex dinosaur words into their vocabularies," said Rick Holmer, director of the museum at Idaho State University.

"He has seen scores of children who correct their parents about dinosaur facts. A new scaled-down but life-like dinosaur exhibit featuring a duckbill Parasaurolophus, a spiked-tailed Stegosaurus and a spike-plated Euoplocephalus should be no different.

"Kids will immediately recognize the Stegosaurus before their parents do," Holmer said.

The rented exhibit, Dinamation is Back, will only be on display 12 weeks starting Feb. 16 because the university will enlarge the museum by one-third its size this year, he said.

It is the fourth group of dinosaur replicas in these years that graze, lurch back and forth, sweep their tails and move their heads around. Over 500,000 people visit the museum each year, Holmer said.

For a few young children it can be an terrifying experience to get inside. But usually with some coaxing, a child's initial fears turn to excitement.

Last year, almost 2,000 Magic Valley school children visited the exhibit. "It's something you could stop and watch and get lost in," Holmer said.

"I like that kind of life," he said. "To me, it's sort of the flip side of Hawaii."

Since television reruns of the "Andy Griffith Show" and "Gomer Pyle USMC" are still on the air, Nabors said people recognize him wherever he goes.

"I'm still on every day," he said. "In some places, they play four or five times a day, depending on the cable channel."

Two pilots Nabors made for new television series were recently turned down by national networks. "I'm not going to do that anymore, anyway," he said. "I've decided I just like to do concerts. It's too hard to do a (television show). And I don't want to move back to Los Angeles. That's probably where I'd have to go if I did a series."

For his show, "The Jim Nabors Hour" the actor spent almost five years commuting from Hawaii.

The son of a police officer, Nabors was born and raised in Alabama. He earned a degree in business administration from the University of Alabama and worked as a film cutter for a television station in Tennessee. He then moved to Los Angeles to work at NBC as a film cutter.

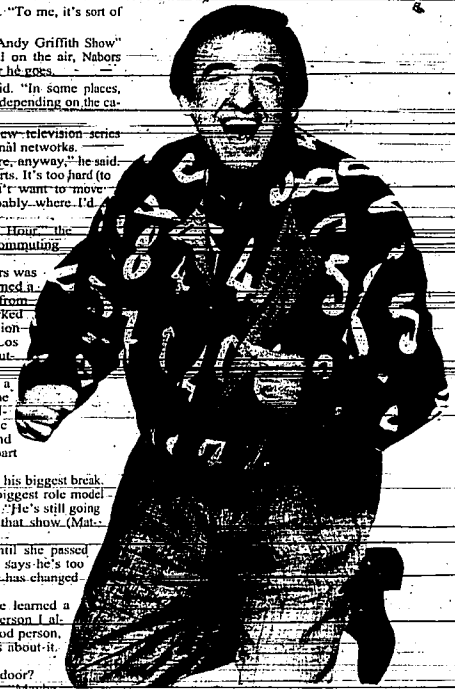
On the side, Nabors performed at a small cabaret theater where he became a regular, performing hillbilly monologues along with operatic arias. Andy Griffith saw the act and invited Nabors to audition for the part of Gomer Pyle.

Nabors said winning that part was his biggest break. "I had for entertaining," Nabors said. "He's still going at it, pretty hard and heavy. Like that show. (Matlock) very much."

Nabors lived with his mother until she passed away three years ago. Although he says he's too old to surf, Nabors doesn't think he has changed much since his career began.

"I've certainly grown, I feel I've learned a whole lot, but I'm still the same person I always was," he said. "I try to be a good person, to work hard and to be nice. That's about it. That's all I've ever tried to be."

So, is it Gomer just the boy next door? "Not quite," he said with a laugh. "Maybe the next farm down."

For visitors from the north, "we're the first gaming stop," Sims says. "We want to have such dynamic entertainment that they'll find no reason to go farther." Cactus Pete's officials already are sure they are keeping people in Jackpot who otherwise may have driven on to Reno or Las Vegas.

• Parasaurolophus — a duckbill dinosaur with a long tubular crest on its head. The crest may have been used to signal others or to cool the brain in warm weather.

The reptile with a parallel-sided crest may have lived in herds and browsed on tough fibrous plants.

The Idaho Museum of Natural History's model is half the actual size of the 30-foot-long, five-ton creature which lived 65 to 90 million years ago.

Stegosaurus, which lived 150 million years ago, had large plates along its back and spikes on the tail. The bony plates were used neither for heat regulation or as display. Spikes on the tail were used for defense.

The model is half the actual size, which was 30 feet long and weighed two tons.

Euoplocephalus, a member of the Ankylosaurs family, which were peaceful plant eaters.

"They had wonderful armor to protect themselves from predators," said Rick Holmer, director of the museum at Idaho State University. "A large part of their bodies that might be attacked was covered with thick plates and spikes."

Euoplocephalus had a huge knob on the end of its tail which was used as a club.

Vegetables, Sims adds.
Cactus Pete's is also retelling its showroom offerings to meet the demands of an audience that is growing younger. An in-house market survey done in January revealed that 40 percent of about 65, more patrons in their 30s are now visiting the resort.

And Sims says patrons will see a wider variety of acts. "The current market is packed with country-western entertainers, which have been the resort's mainstay. But Nate Greene, who books acts full time for Cactus Pete's from his office in Lake Tahoe, is also spotting non-country acts like the Brothers Brothers and Debbie Reynolds.

These acts are proving among the resort's most popular draws, according to Sims. "The non-country acts sell out extremely fast," he notes. Cactus Pete's is also advertising to publicize its big-name acts, instead relying on a mailing list of about 17,000 people who have requested information on entertainment at the resort, Sims says.

The intimate, 600-seat Showroom holds 365 patrons, and the big-name shows frequently sell out weeks in advance. Sims says she and Greene both would like to see a bigger showroom, but there are no plans now for expansion in that area.

Jackpot's remote location hasn't proven to be a barrier to drawing big-name acts, Sims says, and Greene's job is getting easier as knowledge of the resort grows.

"The funny thing is it took us a while to convince the Showroom Brothers that Cactus Pete's was where they came back," the duo have, in fact, been linked to perform again in Jackpot during the spring of 1992.

"We're starting to get calls from big-name acts," Sims says.

"We're starting to build a strong name in the big-name industry. Some past visitors including Glen Campbell and "Sugar" Baker, have even talked up Cactus Pete's to other entertainers," she adds. "They love the room and they love the crowds," Sims says.

Sims theorizes that Cactus Pete's and Jackpot still provide the down-home, free-flowing atmosphere that big-name acts have outgrown. "We really roll out the red carpet for them," she says.

Enjoyable 'Mermaids' brings ordinary fun, Cher to the screen

"Mermaids" plays like a biographical remembrance — a very pleasant one. It is a largely sweet recall, but there are several instances, in which director Richard Benjamin excels.

One is a running gag in which a 15-year-old girl, who has no reason to believe so, thinks she is pregnant. Another is a near tragedy that is given far too much time, a mistake in a film that is basically comic.

"Mermaids" takes place in 1963. Cher is an itinerant, free-spirited mother of two daughters whose fathers are nowhere around. She was married to the first. She hardly knew his second.

The family, close to poverty, lives in a small town in Massachusetts

where Mrs. Flax (Cher) is keeping company with the owner of a local shoe store. The older daughter is embarrassed by her mother's behavior. She also fantasizes about the driver of the local school bus, a young man who seems preoccupied.

Nothing big happens in the film. These are just three people living out their rather ordinary lives, and much of what happens to them is amusing. Even the pregnancy joke is funny; but it, like the near tragedy, should stop before it does.

In the first instance, the mother repeatedly pleads with her daughter. She knows the girl is bothered by something. "Tell me what it is," she says, over and over, and after a time,

you want to grab the kid by the shoulders, and give an answer out of her. The sequence is exasperating more than funny, but these digres-

sions are never enough to seriously damage the movie.

—Cher is reported to have been unhappy with the finished product.

That could be because Winona Ryder, as her older daughter, has more screen time than the star. Cher needn't worry. She does very well with the time she has.

Christina Ricci is the younger daughter who practices holding her breath in the bathtub. She's a swimmer, and she wants to be the best.

Bob Hoskins is the owner of the shoe shop. He, too, does well with his screen time. No one is going to take anything away from him.

In 1963 was the year President Kennedy was assassinated, and the film brings it all back to us. If the movie is remembered for nothing else, it should be for this. The reaction of the townspeople is handled so well, so realistically, the spectator feels as though he is reliving the experience.

"Mermaids," in which the shoe shop owner wants Mrs. Flax to make more commitment than is her custom, features Michael Schoeffling as Joe, the bus driver Charlotte (Ryder) thinks she loves.

Charlotte also thinks of herself as Catholic, and she isn't. When her mother sees her daughter playing with Catholic holy figures, she reminds the girl that they are Jewish, but Charlotte doesn't hear and doesn't much care. She is what she chooses to be. Today, she is Catholic. Tomorrow, she will be Jewish again. This is a young lady who changes her religion and ethnic background any number of times. It is more fancy than flight.

Charlotte is, above all, imaginative, and "Mermaids" is, above all, enjoyable.

Air attack working; Bush should wait

If President Bush has all but made the decision to launch quickly a ground attack against Iraqi troops, as many in Washington fear, he had better have good reason for believing it can be accomplished with a minimum of U.S. casualties.

There are a number of facts that the president must consider as he makes his decision. The first is that there is a tension between ending the war quickly and keeping casualties down. If delaying a ground attack will save lives, then waiting is imperative.

The second is that time is now on the allied side. The Iraqi army is being bombarded daily in Kuwait and has been largely cut off from supplies. The longer the air attack lasts the worse off Iraqi troops will be. Why not degrade them to the maximum extent possible?

Third, the only valid reasons for pressing forward with the ground attack would either be substantial intelligence information that the Iraqi army will roll over and surrender when the attack comes, or indications that the allied coalition is about to fall apart. While we certainly are not privy to intelligence briefings, there is no indication from Iraqi troop defections, for instance, that Hussein's army is demoralized. And there is certainly no indication that the allied coalition is splintering.

The risks of starting the ground war too soon are very high. A large number of American and allied deaths, very clearly a possibility in a ground attack, could quickly turn domestic opinion against the war. Air-fighting on the ground is what

Saddam Hussein wants. His air force has proved useless, but he has a large, battle-hardened ground force. Why play to his strength?

Finally, the reality is that many of the critical allied objectives are being accomplished through air power and do not relate directly to forcing Iraq out of Kuwait. The Iraqi war machine, for example, is being crippled, including its ability to produce weapons of mass destruction.

Eventually, a ground attack may be needed. But what's Bush's rush?

He must explain what he hopes to accomplish by moving quickly. He has sent his top military advisors to the Gulf to assess the situation. We can only hope he is ready to listen to what they have to report and that he has not already made up his mind.

Praise for those who made lake cleanup come about

Kudos to the Clear Springs Trout Co. for its plan to dredge sediments out of Crystal Springs Lake.

The project is welcome news to area residents old enough to remember when you could swim and fish and picnic on its scenic shores. Those folks have mourned the lake's degradation into not much more than a dump spot for many years of accumulated filth.

The project also is an excellent example of industry working together with local state and federal authorities to remedy a longstanding environmental problem.

Cynics might contend that the Bull trout producer doesn't deserve any praise, since the lake's problem results largely from the company's history of letting hatchery effluent run into the lake. But, that wouldn't be fair.

The company has long overcome those destructive practices, and in the past couple of years it has made an admirably honest effort to own up to its responsibility.

Although American industry is becoming more environmentally sensitive all the time, good environmental citizenship is far from universal. Many companies still would rather spend money on legal fees to escape liability than on cleaning up their mistakes.

Clear Springs, bless it, isn't that category. Company President Larry Cope and his staff deserve appreciation for this conscientious move.

While we're handing out pats on the back, let's not forget Bob Burks, the Wendell man who has worked doggedly for the lake's rehabilitation.

Regular readers of letters to the editor know Burks' name well. So do people who attend meetings on water quality issues. Burks has jawbanged tirelessly on behalf of Crystal Springs Lake.

On the strength of his voice, his pen and his stiff neck, Burks almost single-handedly pushed the lake onto this valley's agenda of public concerns. (In fact, he's even at it today, with a letter on this page.)

Also deserving of praise are the Gooding County commissioners, especially Bob Muffley, who have worked long and hard at securing financial support for the lake project.

When the lake finally is restored to something approaching its former pristine loveliness, Burks and the commissioners should share the first boat ride.

This country needs more companies like Clear Springs, which are willing to let their checkbooks speak for their consciences. We also could use a few more people like Bob Burks, who simply won't take no for an answer.

Cheney: Soviet turmoil a threat



Cheney

WASHINGTON (AP) — Defense Secretary Dick Cheney said Thursday that the inability of Kremlin leaders to control events within Soviet borders could pose a greater threat to world peace than any other.

Cheney noted that the Pentagon chief, who during the fall of the Berlin Wall adopted the most cautious view of the administration toward the Soviet Union, also cast doubts on the prospects for U.S.-Soviet arms control treaties.

Cheney's remarks to the House Armed Services Committee that problems remain with the strategic arms reduction treaty, still under negotiation and the conventional forces treaty signed last November, but not yet submitted for Senate ratification.

"Hopefully, we will be able to conclude those arms control agreements, but it ain't over yet," Cheney said at a session dealing with U.S.-Soviet relations, the Persian Gulf War, and the defense budget.

Talks between U.S. and Soviet officials on cutting arsenals of strategic nuclear missiles, bombers and submarines resume this week in Geneva following an unsuccessful effort to conclude the pact in Washington.

The prospective treaty was to be the centerpiece for a U.S.-Soviet summit in Moscow next week. The budget is a response to the collapse of the Warsaw Pact, the Soviet Union's continuing withdrawal from Eastern Europe and its lessening influence there, Cheney said.

Cheney unveiled for members of Congress his fiscal 1992 defense budget, calling for steep reductions in troop strength and acquisition of aircraft, ships and other weapons in response to a diminishing Soviet threat to the West.

That means that the greatest threat to the neighbors of the Soviet Union in the future may well come more from the Soviet inability to control events inside the Soviet Union than it will from any conscious policy of aggression. It is their influence by military means, the Pentagon chief said.

Cheney did not specify how he thought such a new threat could evolve. But some military and political analysts have expressed concern that if the Soviet Union drifts into deep chaos, nuclear weapons and other military gear could fall into renegade hands.

Cheney said the new defense plan is a six-year look that's being offered at a time of considerable turmoil and uncertainty out there in the world. And I would like to reserve the right to be able to come back at some future time and say we can't go down as fast or as far as this program would take it.

Although the budget for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1 slashes the number of troops by 91,000 and cancels several weapons, the Pentagon is seeking an increase in funds for the Strategic Defense Initiative and the B-2 stealth bomber.

New bill would establish regional election primaries

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Alan Dixon introduced a bill Thursday that would create eight regional presidential primaries and diminish the influence of early voting in Iowa and New Hampshire.

Those two states, the first to make their presidential preferences set the tone for the entire campaign season, although they have only 2 percent of the U.S. population, the Illinois Democrat said.

Dixon would divide the country into eight regions with primaries or caucuses held from March through June. The Federal Election Commission would hold a lottery to choose the order of elections.

Powell sees military as chance for minorities in United States

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gen. Colin Powell, the first black chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, said Thursday the military offers minorities opportunities denied them elsewhere in American society.

"I ain't done bad," he said. Powell, testifying before the House Armed Services Committee, was asked about the role of minorities in the all-volunteer military and the impact of proposed troop cuts in coming years.

"I wish that there were other activities in our society and in our nation that were as open as the military is to upward mobility, to achievement, to allowing them in," Powell said.

"I wish that corporate America, I wish the trade unions around the na-

tion would show the same level of openness and opportunity to minorities that the military has," he said.

Powell offered no apologies for the disproportionate number of minorities serving in the military. Blacks make up about 12 percent of the U.S. population and 25 percent of the fighting force in the Persian Gulf.

"The fact that we have a higher percentage than the percentage that exists in the general population doesn't trouble me at all," Powell said.

"That's why I came in. To get a job. \$222.30 a month."

"You've done well," Rep. Beverly Byron, D-Md. said.

"I ain't done bad," Powell returned.

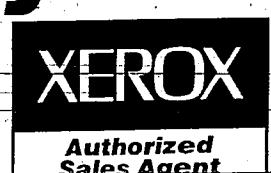

Israeli forces raiding Lebanon

SHOMERA, Israel (AP) — Israeli ground forces launched their first "deep-penetration" raid in Lebanon since the Gulf War began, hitting a PLO base to stem a resurgence of Israeli-inspired guerrilla actions, the army said Thursday.

The overnight raid preceded the deployment of the Lebanese Army in the southern part of Tyre, in a move by the Beirut government to reassert control over guerrillas in the area north of Israel's self-proclaimed security zone.

Israel expects the Lebanese move

to drive the Palestinian fighters out of their bases north of the security zone, Defense Ministry media adviser Dan Navet said.

Military analysts drew a link between the offensive and the war in the Persian Gulf, as pro- and anti-Israeli forces jockey for power in a Lebanese proxy war.

But the Israelis said the Lebanese Army was not displacing Palestinian fighters in "sensitive" areas. The Lebanese "are deployed in the periphery," said a military spokesman, Col. Ranaan Gissin.

Gissin said the move southward was a signal by Syria, which backs the Lebanese government, that it "doesn't want more trouble in its Lebanese backyard."

Under a series of artillery fire, the Israeli ground force hit a base where they demolished four vehicles and blew up an ammunition warehouse.

Lebanese reports said the raid was near Sarba, a mountain village 12 miles north of the border.

Israel said all its men returned unharmed.

Report: Rooms bugged

MOSCOW (AP) — A group of officials broke into two KGB rooms over the office of Russian President Boris Yeltsin and found bugging devices, Soviet media reported Thursday.

The group opened the rooms Wednesday night and found the devices and a nest of antennas, the Interfax news agency said.

The liberal daily Independent Newspaper said the rooms were occupied by the KGB.

The officials were investigating claims that the secret police agen-

cy was eavesdropping on all telephone lines at the Russian Federation building, Interfax said.

Yeltsin is a popular rival of Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev and the focus of hard-liners' fury over what they say is his disintegration of the Soviet Union.

He has alleged KGB harassment in the past.

Armed Forces Marshal Sergei Akhromeyev lashed out at Yeltsin on Thursday, accusing him of trying to overthrow the government.

Rain forest acreage destroyed by blaze

BOGOTA, Colombia (AP) — Fire has destroyed 185,000 acres of a rain forest that remains much as it was millions of years ago when it gave birth to most of the Amazon's animals and plants, authorities said Thursday.

Peasants and government workers had yet to control the 6-day-old fire in the Macarena forest, said Camilo Cardenas, an official at the presidential office of natural disasters.

"The damage is quite grave," he said, speaking over the RCN radio network.

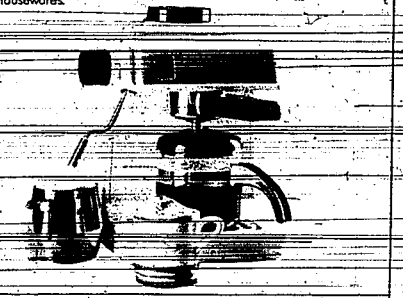

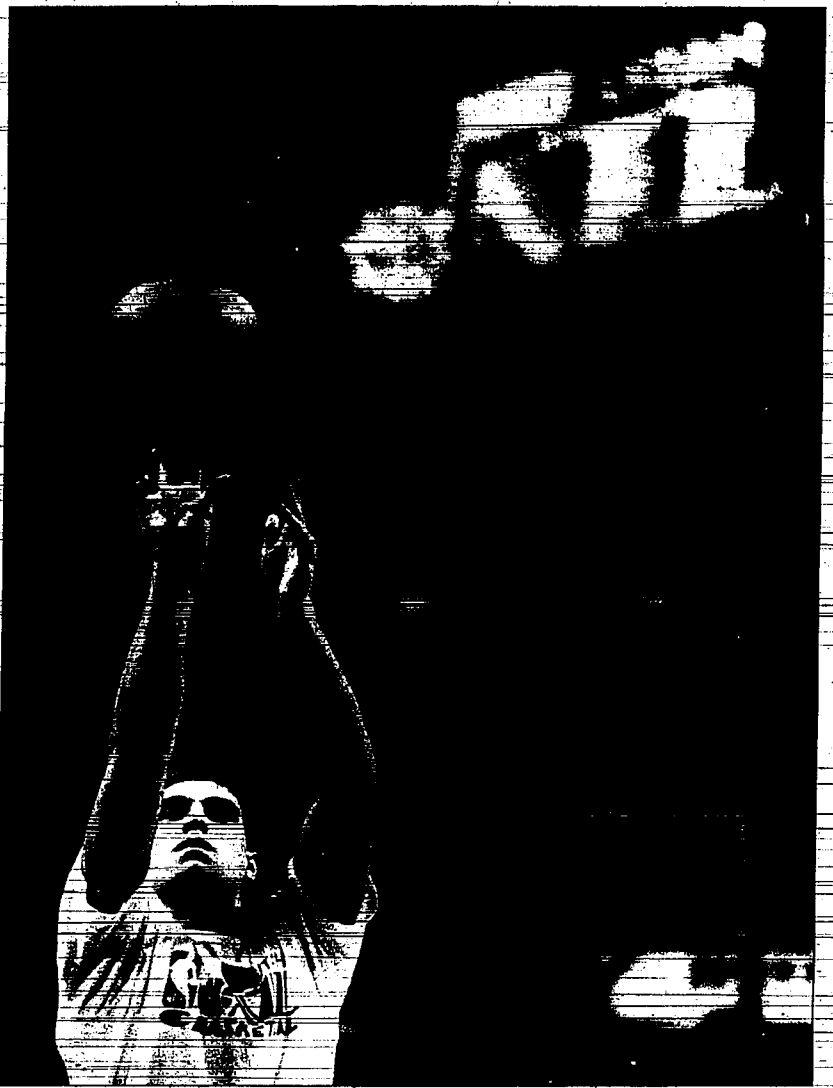

INDIANAPOLIS — Indianapolis Colts coach Ron Meyer was offered a contract extension Thursday that could be worth \$3 million over the next four seasons.

According to Irsay, the potential four-year contract could be worth between \$2 million and \$3 million if various incentives are reached.

"We flew 7,000 (statute) miles," Newman said.

NEW YORK — Mike Greenwell received the biggest contract in Boston Red Sox history on Thursday, agreeing to a four-year deal worth approximately \$12 million.

Greenwell, 27, had threatened to become a free agent after the 1992 season. His current contract is a two-year deal that expires in 1991.

Greenwell hit .297 last season with 14 homers and 73 RBIs. His status as Boston's top-paid player probably won't last for long, though. Roger Clemens is negotiating a contract extension that will be worth well over \$4 million a season and possibly more than \$5 million a season.

Late Wednesday night, Boston avoided an arbitration hearing with outfielder Tom Brunansky, agreeing to a two-year contract worth \$5.55 million with a club option for 1993.

Seven other players in arbitration agreed to one-year deals, reducing the number remaining in arbitration to 62.

Dow drops as stock market turns in mixed results in active trading

NEW YORK — The stock market turned mixed in very active trading Tuesday, running into resistance from sellers after the rally of the past several weeks.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks, which has risen 10,225 points in the week's first three sessions, dropped 20.30 to 3,810.64.

Advancing issues slightly outnumbered declines in nationwide trading of New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, with 849 up, 837 down and 377 unchanged.

Volume on the floor of the Big Board reached 292.19 million shares, up from 276.94 million Wednesday and the heaviest total since a 318.89 million-shares day on Jan. 17.

Analysts said traders were cashing in some of their gains after the sharp advance that has carried the Dow Jones industrials nearly 15 percent higher since early January.

The rally has begun to attract widespread publicity, prompting some Wall Streeters to conclude that it might be due for at least a temporary pause.

The news about interest rates and the progress of the war in the Persian Gulf still seemed to be going generally in the bulls' favor.

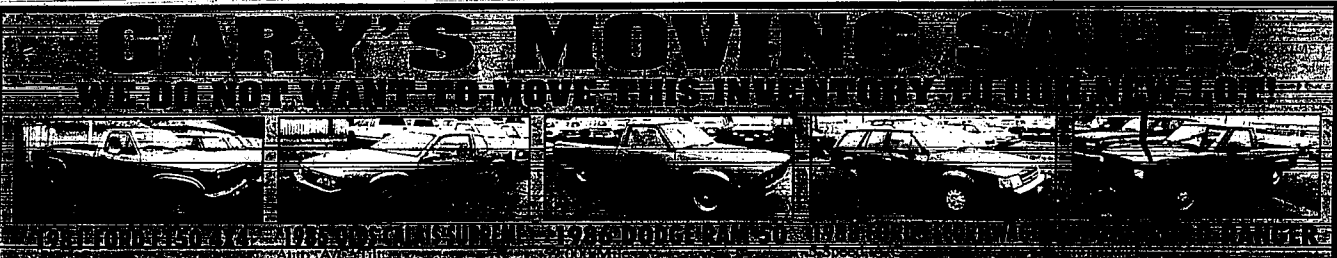

'Lucy & Desi: Before the Laughter' traces the bumpy real-life romance

It's a considerable challenge. On Sunday, Feb. 10, America's best-known redhead is being played by America's least-known-redhead. Taking on the role of the legendary Lucille Ball in the biographical CBS movie "Lucy & Desi: Before the Laughter" is Frances Fisher, an unfamiliar name except to those daytime soap fans with long memo-

ries. But the dignified Fisher approaches the role with the same cool professionalism displayed by Ball herself. "I didn't find playing her intimidating at all," Fisher says. "I approached this role as any actor would. The real-life Lucy was an actress and a woman, and that's who I play. She had high points in her life and low points, just like any person."

Thanks to "I Love Lucy" reruns, everyone is convinced that he or she knows the real Lucy. But as the CBS movie shows, Lucille Ball was a different person from the wacky Lucy Ricardo. Although Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz were on-screen sweethearts, the movie asserts that Ball spent much of her marriage to Arnaz coping with his constant infidelities.

After innumerable fights and a near-divorce, Ball decides that the best way to keep Arnaz in the cast is to create a TV show in which they would co-star. "Lucy & Desi: Before the Laughter" is set on the premiere night of "I Love Lucy," with Ball and Arnaz alternately remembering their bumpy romance from the day they met in 1940.

Fisher says Ball was a challenge

to play because her character "was quite intricate. She was very strong personally. She knew what she wanted, and she knew how to get it. She was very determined." Fisher also credits her working relationship with Maurice Benard, the young actor who plays Arnaz, with easing the experience. "When I went to audition with him, I looked at him and knew instantly he was the one," Fisher says. "We spoke the same language." That language may have been daytime soap opera.

Benard played Nico Kelly on "All My Children" until last year, and Fisher played Deborah Saxon on "The Edge of Night" from 1976-81 and Suzette Saxon on "The Guiding Light" in 1985. "We made 'Lucy & Desi' in 19 days," Fisher says, although a feature film normally takes two to three months. "But soaps are taped more rapidly — an episode

a day — so both actors knew how to work fast. Despite this, Fisher doesn't seem to look back on daytime soaps very fondly. "They're the worst of film and theater," she sniffs.

And Fisher has done both. As the daughter of a traveling construction superintendent, she grew up all over the world. After she relocated to California, Fisher got small roles in such films as "Tough Guys Don't Dance" (1987) and 1989's "Pink Cadillac" (tabloids have linked her name romantically with that film's star, Clint Eastwood).

ABC on top, NBC on bottom again as war news plucks proud peacock

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Persian Gulf War apparently has plucked a few feathers from NBC's proud peacock. For the third consecutive week, the usually No. 1 network finished last in the ratings race.

According to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co., ABC was the most watched network last week, earning a 12.7 average rating. CBS was second with 12.4 and NBC was third with 12.1.

Each ratings point represents 951,000 homes.

NBC's vice president of audience research, Preston Beckman, noted that his network's decline began with the start of war in the Persian Gulf.

"What's happened is there's been a major disruption in viewing habits and in what people are looking for because of the war," Beckman said. "It's hurt us."

With television news providing moment-by-moment war updates, viewers last week appeared to be looking for relief.

They found it in warmhearted specials, comedy series and music, most of which were on CBS and ABC.

The most-watched program on television last week was CBS'

14-year-old has impressive resume

Q: What else has Mayim Bialik of the new NBC series "Blossom" appeared in?

A: Bialik, 14, has built a number of credits: She's best known for her starring role in the short-lived series "Molloy," and for her co-starring role in "Beauty and the Beast."

She's also had recurring roles in "The Facts of Life," "Webster," "Once-a-Hero" and "MacGyver," and guest appearances on several prime-time series.

On film, she can be seen in "Beaches" and "Pumpkinhead." Bialik has also been the voices of characters in cartoons and commercials, including the Peanuts' gang member Peppermint Patty. Bialik was born in San Diego and raised in Los Angeles.

Q: Has Will Wheaton left "Star Trek: The Next Generation"?

A: This has been the most frequently asked question we

received in the last month. Wheaton has left the series but, in the storyline, his character Wesley Crusher has been sent to Star Fleet, leaving the door open for guest appearances.

In the meantime, Wheaton is busy doing other projects — he will appear in the Louis Gossett Jr. film "Toy Soldiers" (due to be released in April) and has begun work on another movie.

He has also made an educational video for NASA that is designed to encourage students in high school and at career fairs to get involved in science.

Q: Will there be any more new episodes of "The Days and Nights of Molly Dodd"?

A: Currently, the final 13 episodes of the Blair-Brown series are being shown Saturdays on Lifetime Cable.

After one season and 26 episodes on NBC and two seasons and 39 episodes on Lifetime, "The Days

and Nights of Molly Dodd" has concluded production. Lifetime will have exclusive rights to all episodes until August, 1992, when the series will likely go into general syndication.

Q: What are the clear, rectangular plastic plates that sit on a stand in front of public figures when they are at a podium?

A: They're actually called TelePrompTers, the product name given to the high-tech cue cards that display a speech while giving the appearance that the speaker is talking directly to the audience or camera (TV newscasters use them too).

The speech or newscast is scrolled on the TelePrompTer. Usually, they are located next to or directly in front of the TV camera, but in larger gatherings, such as political conventions where the cameras are too far away, TelePrompTers are attached to the podium.

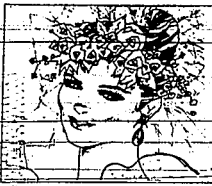

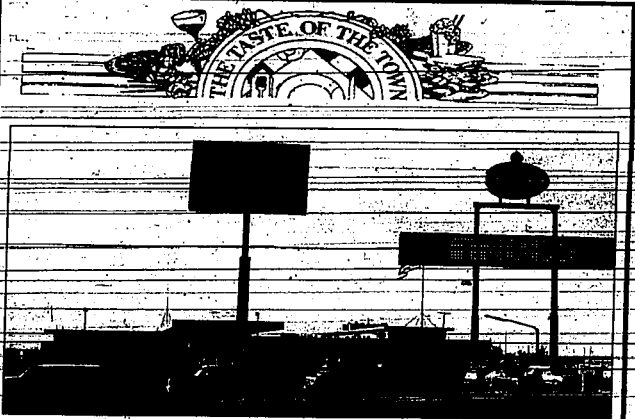

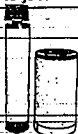
