# U.S. rejects Soviet plan

WASHINGTON — The Soviet-Iraqi proposal to end the Persian Gulf War is "clearly unacceptable to the United States," a senior Bush administration official said early Friday.

"This official speaking under rules that prevent use of his name, volunteered the assessment following a meeting of President Bush with his senior national security advisers that lasted more than an hour and 40 minutes.

"The main conclusion is that the Soviet proposal represents a conditional withdrawal which is clearly beyond the scope of the U.N. resolutions," the official said.

"The Soviet call for lifting of economic sanctions and lifting the U.N. resolutions amounts to a conditional withdrawal that would be unacceptable to the United States."

The official said administration officials were communicating that conclusion to coalition partners and expected to make public comments later Friday.

Before Bush's meeting, which broke up at midnight, the administration was

careful not to reject the Soviet plan, saying only that Bush had serious concerns about it.

"The war itself continues," said spokesman Martin Fitzwater, acknowledging that Bush had not decided yet whether to open a ground assault that for days had seemed imminent.

Earlier in the day, Defense Secretary Dick Cheney said allied forces were massing for "one of the largest land assaults of modern times," a comment that lent urgency to the Iraqi mission to Moscow.

Fitzwater said, "We have had our hopes raised before" but pledged that "we are taking a look at" the Moscow plan. He said the White House would consult with coalition leaders, and Secretary of State James A. Baker III began the contacts with calls to foreign ministers of

## Agreement contains these 8 points

MOSCOW — Here are the eight points in the Iraqi-Soviet agreement, as outlined by Kremlin spokesman Vitaly Ignatenko:

- 1) Iraq agrees to a complete, unconditional withdrawal from Kuwait.
- 2) The withdrawal begins the second day after the cessation of hostilities.
- 3) The withdrawal takes place in a fixed time frame.
- 4) After the withdrawal of two-thirds of the Iraqi forces, the United Nations'

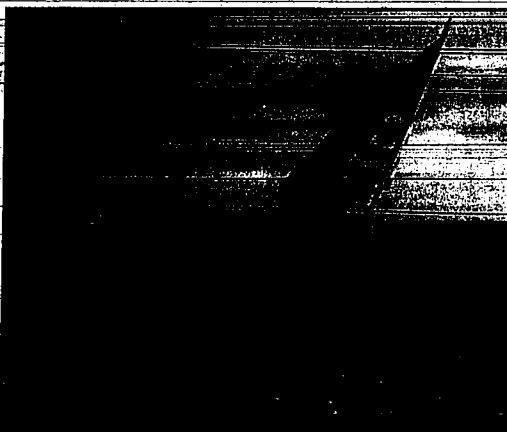
economic sanctions against Iraq cease to apply.

5) After the full withdrawal, the causes for the remaining U.N. resolutions against Iraq cease to exist.

6) After the cease-fire, all prisoners of war will be immediately released.

7) The withdrawal will be monitored by countries not directly involved in hostilities, to be entrusted by the U.N. Security Council.

8) The work on determining details of the agreement continues.

## Alternative to land war?

WASHINGTON — Like it or not, the Bush administration was presented Thursday with a bloodless alternative to a land assault against Iraq, just as it appeared poised to launch that major new phase of the war.

Rep. Lee Hamilton captured the hope and skepticism that shadowed the Soviet-Iraqi proposal to end the Persian Gulf War. "I don't think we can lightly dismiss it," he said, "but I also think it's unacceptable in some of its terms and probably needs further negotiation."

The White House said it had serious concerns about the proposal, but would

examine it while continuing the air assault against Iraqi positions. Bush administration officials have repeatedly said that nothing short of total, unconditional and immediate withdrawal from Kuwait is acceptable.

Still, the proposal was viewed as a serious one, which if not sufficient to meet President Bush's demands could at least force the administration to put off a massive land invasion while its potential is explored.

Hamilton, D-Ind., a senior member of

## Simplot seed spuds may remain under quarantine

TWIN FALLS — The 200,000 sacks of potatoes J.R. Simplot Co. ordered from Canada's Atlantic Coast Thursday. The embargo was lifted for an area that grows just 20 percent of the Atlantic province's seed potatoes, however.

"The new import rules permit the entry of seed potatoes ... that originate in seed potato inspection district 5 and 6 on Prince Edward Island and are accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by

Agriculture Canada," the USDA press release said.

Nelson said the Simplot potatoes did not come from district 5 and probably did not originate from district 6.

Fred Zizza, a Simplot Co. spokesman, said the company would not know until today exactly where the seed came from, although he acknowledged that it did not come from district 5.

Commercial potato "seeds" are actually small pieces of potato. Potato quantities are measured in units of 100 pounds referred to

as "sacks."

The 40,000 sacks of Prince Edward Island Shepody seed that are now sitting in railcars in Idaho and Oregon are "foundation" seed which means they have passed the strictest disease tests. Zizza said Simplot Co. does not believe the seed is contaminated, but the USDA has objected to some of Canada's seed-testing procedures.

The disease at the heart of the controversy is the necrotic strain of potato

## Ban could cost Idaho NPR

WASHINGTON — Energy Secretary James Watkins told a Senate committee Thursday that Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus' ban on radioactive waste shipments could hurt his state's chances of winning federal nuclear energy projects.

"When we hear that debate and all the tough rhetoric against the DOE, calling us liars and one thing and another, it doesn't sit too well when you have to make a decision," Watkins told the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee during a hearing on the Bush administration's proposed national energy policy.

Specifically, Watkins said Andrus' position has reduced chances that the Energy Department will build a defense-

related New Production Reactor at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

"I'm not going to want to put something in the state that is constantly lighting us in the court with a litigious relationship ...," he said. "I hate to see Idaho, a great friend of defense over these years, all of a sudden change posture, even though I recognize that much of the rhetoric that Governor Andrus leans on us, frankly, has been beneficial in many ways."

But Andrus has said he does not want Idaho to be the home of the reactor, which would produce tritium for use in nuclear weapons.

Beyond that, the governor said Thursday at a Boise news conference that he would not be bullied into agreeing to allow more waste into the state.

## SkyWest cuts air fares

TWIN FALLS — A sagging airline market and Twin Falls' recent designation as "air destination" city mean Magic Valley travelers will pay markedly lower fares for flights to Salt Lake City and points beyond.

SkyWest Airlines will cut one-way fares to and from Salt Lake City from \$127 to \$89, the company's vice president of sales and market planning, Ron Reber, said Thursday. The fares could begin as early as next week and ticket prices might even be lower than \$89, he said.

In addition, because Twin Falls is a gateway to Sun Valley, Delta Airlines has designated the city a ski destination point. That too will save local travelers money by removing stay-over restrictions for lower fares, a local travel agent said.

SkyWest's decision to cut fares in and out of Salt Lake City stemmed from a slow airline economy and from an evaluation of fare prices for local travelers, Reber said.

The company announced last week that it lost \$615,000 in the last three months of 1990. The recession and perhaps even travel jitters because of the

Here are developments in the Persian Gulf War: Moscow

Iraq and the Soviet Union have agreed on steps that could lead to an Iraqi withdrawal from Kuwait and an end to the Persian Gulf War, a Kremlin spokesman said early Friday. The Kremlin spokesman, Vitaly Ignatenko, made the announcement after more than two hours of talks between President Mikhail S. Gorbachev and Iraq's foreign minister, Tariq Aziz, on the terms of a Soviet peace plan proposed earlier this week.

The agreement contained no mention of the Palestinian problem or the Arab-Israeli conflict — the issues that Iraq had previously linked to all discussions of its invasion of Kuwait.

Gorbachev immediately telephoned President Bush to lay out the proposals, and the U.S. chief executive "raised serious concerns about several points," said White House spokesman Martin Fitzwater. Bush had no immediate response, and would be studying the plan, the spokesman said.

"war itself continues," Fitzwater added. "There's no change at this point in our prosecution of the war."

One key drawback in the U.S. view was believed to be the lack of any apparent Iraqi commitment to pay reparations for war damage.

The Bush administration believes the Persian Gulf War will cost \$58 billion to \$77 billion this fiscal year, according to Defense Department documents.

The CIA estimates that 10 to 15 percent of Iraq's tanks and artillery in Kuwait had been destroyed by allied bombing, sources said, far below the Pentagon's 35 percent figure.

The discrepancy is the result of different tools and philosophies used in assessing the damage, said officials who describe the CIA figures as a "worst-case scenario."

Around the gulf

Three Iraqi Scud missiles were fired at Bahrain early Friday but were intercepted by U.S. Patriot missiles, Western military officials said.

7 Americans die in crash

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Seven American soldiers were killed Thursday when an Army medical evacuation helicopter crashed in Saudi Arabia, U.S. officials reported.

Initial reports said the UH-60 Blackhawk was attempting to land in bad weather.

The U.S. Command said the victims were the helicopter's four crew members and three passengers.

Their names were withheld pending notification of next of kin.

It was the deadliest non-combat accident since Operation Desert Storm began Jan. 17.

The U.S. Command said the helicopter was returning from combat operations along the border.

Two other U.S. aircraft also were lost, the command said Thursday in a briefing in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

It said an Air Force F-16 fighter-bomber crashed after suffering engine failure while being refueled in flight, and a Marine CH-46 helicopter was wrecked in an emergency landing.

The F-16 pilot ejected and was rescued.

One helicopter crewman suffered a broken leg, the command said.

Iraqi President Saddam Hussein said his country and army are ready for all-out war if President Bush continues to reject Iraq's proposals for an end to the Gulf War.

In a 40-minute radio address to his people, Saddam reiterated the linkage between an Iraqi withdrawal from Kuwait and an Israeli withdrawal from lands that are home to Palestinians.

Two or three Iraqi Scud missiles were fired into north-central Saudi Arabia in a rare daylight attack, the U.S. command said. The two Scuds were intercepted by Patriot missiles and the debris fell harmlessly into the desert.

Elsewhere

In Israel, Defense Minister Moshe Arens urged the United States, France and other weapons exporters to stop selling arms to the Middle East as part of a postwar arms control agreement.

Arens also said Thursday that despite Moscow's diplomatic efforts to end the war, "there will never be a return to the kind of influence that the Soviet Union had in Arab countries until recently."

Marine leader: Avoid frontal assault

ABOARD USS NASSAU, Persian Gulf (AP) — The commander of Marine amphibious forces in the gulf said he would try to avoid attacking Iraqi defenses directly in an assault on Kuwait beaches.

"We wouldn't go straight at anything," Maj. Gen. Henry Jenkins said, adding that many Iraqi units have been moved in to defend the Kuwait coast.

Much of the coastline is urbanized and — Iraqi soldiers have fortified many of the buildings, which would be targets of naval gunfire and air strikes before Marines hit the beaches, he said.

"If we land into a built-up area, there will be collateral damage, but obviously we do not want to destroy the country," he told reporters Wednesday aboard his command ship, the U.S.S. Nassau.

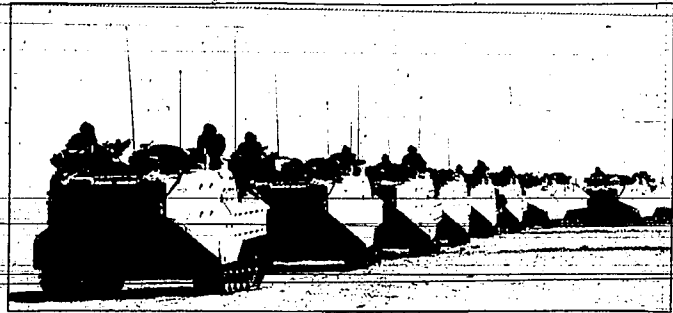
Jenkins commands a 17,000-man Marine landing force that has been at sea for six months and now waits in the Persian Gulf.

He said possible operations for his men include a full-scale landing, one or more limited operations, or even a decoy assault or feint to tie down Iraqi troops at the coast while allied ground forces attack inland.

"We've seen more and more of them along the coast; we've drawn them there," said the 52-year-old general from San Jose, Calif.

Jenkins said he expects stiff resistance because "the Iraqi army is not down and out by any stretch of the imagination. They're hurting, no doubt about that. But I would not count them out."

If Marines land their M-60 tanks, light vehicles and other assault forces to dislodge Iraqi defenders, the "mainstream of close combat will create a high risk of casualties from friendly fire, Jenkins said.

"You hope not, but the potential for this is high," he said. "The jets are going so damn fast. Telling friend from foe can really be a problem if you have 12 vehicles out there and a pilot coming in at 400 knots."

To guard against friendly fire, which killed seven Marines in fighting earlier this month, Jenkins said brightly colored panels and other markers would be placed atop vehicles and tanks so pilots could identify them.

"That's the only way you can tell from the air," he said.

In addition, he said, Marine pilots have been trained to recognize silhouettes of U.S. vehicles and Iraqi equipment, most of which is Soviet-built.

The silhouettes "might not help Marine pilots if they fly missions to support Egyptian or Syrian units because those armies also have Soviet-built weapons."

Jenkins said an amphibious force

of about 30 ships moved into the gulf in the past two weeks, after conducting five major exercises to rehearse a possible landing.

If a landing comes, the Marines will have the support of strike aircraft from four carriers, the 16-inch guns from two battleships, their own Harrier close-support jets and Cobra attack helicopters, and land-based Air Force planes.

Marine Harrier jets flew combat missions from an amphibious assault ship for the first time Wednesday.

Air and naval support is designed not only to provide cover for the vulnerable landing force, but also to drive entrenched Iraqis from their bunkers into the open.

Only direct hits will destroy dug-in troops and armor, Jenkins said.

"There's a lot of smoke when a bomb explodes, but in many cases all you've done is give him a headache," he said. "He can still fight."

Marine, Navy and Air Force planes and naval guns have been methodically hitting targets in Kuwait to soften enemy forces for a possible landing.

"I suppose enough is when you can go through without taking any fire," Jenkins said. He acknowledged that a field completely cleared of the enemy is not realistic, but added: "I'll take all the support I can get."

The Nassau rocked throughout the meeting with Jenkins, who said the unpredictable weather this time of year could upset landing plans. After a day of rain, the command ship was plowing through the 12-foot waves, buffeted by winds of 34 knots.

Jenkins said sea conditions tended to be calmer near shore. If the Marines make the landing, their amphibious transports will not come close to shore, within eight of enemy guns, as was the practice in World War II.

Army hits Iraq with artillery

IN NORTHERN SAUDI ARABIA (AP) — U.S. Army troops pounded targets in Iraq with artillery Thursday, one of the heaviest days of shelling since the war began.

In a prelude to a ground war, four batteries of the advanced Multiple Launch Rocket System fired several hundred rounds of rockets each capable of scattering 644 bomblets.

The targets included armor, infantry and artillery positions, air defense systems, combat engineers' equipment and at least one command-and-control center at the brigade or battalion level, artillery officers said.

Officers said it would be at least a day before they could begin gathering information on whether the attacks were successful.

A senior officer, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the artillery raids hit occupied targets 60 percent of the time.

The Multiple Launch Rocket System is considered the Army's state-of-the-art artillery because the mobile launchers, which resemble an armored personnel carrier with an oblong box on top, can be towed to a new position and then quickly leave the area before opposing radar can lock on the positions and return fire.

Col. Jim Gass, 49, a U.S. Army artillery commander, said Iraqi return artillery fire has been inaccurate and sporadic. He said allied forces welcome it so they can use it to pinpoint Iraqi positions.

"We hope we do get return fire," said Gass, 49, of Carney, Okla.

Each launcher can launch 12 missiles in seconds. During Thursday's barrage, the sky was filled with giant, shrieking bullets of fire as four batteries spaced a few hundred yards apart fired rockets from 11 to 19 miles into the southern Iraq sky.

Minutes later, the batteries barreled out of the area, an operation the launch crews call "shoot and scoot."

"You go in; you shoot; you get out. By the time they figure out where you are, you're gone," said Pfc. Jim Hooks, 20, of Memphis, Tenn.

Customs official puts U.S. seizures at \$10 million

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States has shut down companies secretly controlled by Iraq and seized nearly \$10 million in goods destined for Baghdad since U.N. sanctions were imposed, officials said Thursday.

Customs agents have made 70 seizures of goods since the United Nations embargoed Iraqi trade shortly after troops invaded Kuwait Aug. 2, said John C. Kelley Jr., director of the Customs Service's strategic in-

vestigations division. Testifying before a House Energy and Commerce subcommittee, Kelley said: "You may ask is the embargo working? I believe it is."

But a former Reagan administration official told the panel that Iraq has been able to obtain virtually anything he sought to build his arsenal over the last decade.

"The sad truth is that the Western countries were all too eager to supply Iraq with anything it wanted," said Stephen Bryen, a former Defense Department official and now a private consultant. "The export control system ... is run by insensitive bureaucrats who would not be able to tell the difference between chemical weapons aerosol and an underarm deodorant."

Kelley said goods seized over the last six months include spare parts for automobiles and aircraft, air conditioning and spare parts.

### How ground troops are treated

Mobile medical units follow ground troops, treating casualties immediately. The injured then are moved through a system of hospitals, each providing another level of care. Severely wounded are removed from the war region in five to 10 days. Each military branch has its own hospitals, but all casualties enter a system much like the Army's.

# Infantrymen watch glare of rockets, anxiously wait for ground war to start

IN NORTHERN SAUDI ARABIA (AP) — When paratroopers have to wait, they call it racketeering.

It refers to the oval pattern their planes fly over a jump zone when they have their gear on their chutes ready, their adrenalin flowing. All they need to jump is a green light.

Waiting for G-Day, the day for the ground war to start, is like racketeering for Bravo Company, 2nd Battalion, 125th Infantry Regiment of the 82nd Airborne Division.

"It's like the space shuttle. The countdown's been stopped before blast-off," said Pfc. Jerry Henderson, 20 of Caldwell, Idaho.

Nevertheless, life goes on in the Saudi Arabian desert for the line troopers of Bravo Company, who call themselves "The Nasty Boys."

Here is a day in their life.

6 p.m. — Sunset. A crescent moon hangs in the sky like a bright slice of melon. This is when an infantry company usually gets down to business.

"Out here, night is when we get to work," said 1st Sgt. Michael O'Neal, 35, of Ripley, W.Va. "We have heightened security at night. All our missions have been at night. It's a reverse cycle."

Most nights, O'Neal makes his rounds, checking those on guard duty and keeping an eye on fighting positions.

"We're not really in a military camp ever be for war," the sergeant says. "We want to make sure we don't lose our edge. It's easy to become complacent if there ain't bullets coming at you every day."

8 p.m. Staff Sgt. Steven Ahlfeld, 24, of Jackson, Ariz., is using his night vision goggles to adjust an infrared scope on the M-16 rifle. The invisible beam allows him to shoot targets more than a football field away in the dark.

"It's right on. Got to get everything right before I go to sleep. I'd rather spend the extra time now," he says.

An infantry company is like a single complex organism. Individual grunts make up fire teams, which make up squads, which form platoons, which evolves into a company of about 150 soldiers.

The Nasty Boys see themselves as rebels, misfits and hell-raisers who manhandle, act, top-notch, infantrymen. They go the extra mile to lunge harder, fustier and tougher.

"We get the job done no matter what. They can count on us. We always come through," Ahlfeld says.

Grunt-sleeping on the ground, many of them snoring, are awakened by an artillery barrage aimed at Iraqi positions. They can see tracers from a distant skirmish and lightning - flashing - over the desert while rain pelts them.

"The watch always goes faster when there's a show," says Lt. John Black, 24, of Williamsburg, Va. Most of the paratroopers wrap themselves in ponchos and sleep in the rain.

2 a.m. A red glare knives through the dump sky from a multiple launch rocket system firing that lasts an hour.

3 a.m. Spec. 4 Darrin Janish, 21, of Apple Valley, Wis., rises for guard duty.

"Everybody's got a purpose in life. Mine is to sit in a hole," Janish jokes. "There's a light at the end of the tunnel. Someday, this is going to end."

6 a.m. — The sun isn't up yet but Bravo Company is thanks to the gravelly voice of 1st Sgt. O'Neal. The company's warning tent has already been dismantled in anticipation of an attack. O'Neal lights a heat lamp in his foxhole to heat water for coffee and warm up an MRE, or Meal, Ready to Eat.

Soldiers look like prairie dogs coming out of their sandy holes. Pfc. Matthew DeMeo, 20, of Aguilar, Colo., grabs an MRE: "Chicken is a disgusting." He also slams a clip into his M-16.

The first order of business is to clean the sand and morning mist off the weapons.

Pfc. Anthony Johnson, 26, of Waco, Texas, runs a toothbrush and soap over his gun barrel to clean the sun is a rising red ball. "When do have to use it, I want to make sure she's there for me. She sleeps right there in the bag with me," Johnson says.

Morning is also the time to check gas masks, brush teeth, shave in cold water, clean ammunition, take care of personal hygiene and maybe write a letter before the training schedule begins.

7:30 a.m. — Spec. 4 Darryl Smallwood, 21, of Gainesville, Ga., gets off guard duty and heads for his hooch — a poncho-covered hole with burlap strung over his sleeping bag. It's a modest but dry home.

He listens to his favorite country song on tape: "Jesus Hold My Hand."

"It gives me hope. When I get down, I listen to this tape," Smallwood says. "I've got too much I want to do in life to die in a place like this."

10:10 a.m. — Sgt. Darrin Jones' mortar squad is cleaning its 60mm

"I've been sitting here so long it's a psychological advantage," Jones says. "These guys are real tough. They're going to go home. The only way we're going to go home is really do some damage."

Noon — The sun has defeated the overnight chill. Sgt. David Kent, 27, of San Francisco, pauses from his reading and weapons study to eat a ham slice MRE for lunch.

He also takes a moment to think about his unseen Iraqi counterparts. "I honestly feel sorry for those men. The majority of them are victims of circumstance," Kent says. "They may be my enemy, but I have more in common with them than anything else. We're all stuck out here in the desert-facing each other, waiting for the fighting and the dying."

1 p.m. — A cluster of soldiers listens to the news on a shortwave radio.

"Waiting is boring. Wait around and see what doesn't happen today," says Sgt. Rich Gonzales, 24, of San Antonio, Texas. "My favorite word for this place is goodbye. It's a dump. A wasteland."

## LaRocco bill would use Idaho silver for gulf medal

WASHINGTON (AP) — A silver medal for the military in Operation Desert Storm would honor servicemen and women, as well as help the silver industry in northern Idaho, Congresswoman Larry LaRocco says.

The Idaho Democrat plans to introduce legislation to create the medal.

"This medal would be given to all military personnel serving in the Kuwait theater of operations as a token of our nation's gratitude," LaRocco said Thursday. "It would be a patriotic gesture, recognizing the bravery and gallant service of our service men

and women." Each medal would contain about one-half ounce of silver. It would go to the military personnel after their arrival home. It would be produced at one of the four U.S. mints. Design and other details will be considered later. The silver medal is the first bill LaRocco has sponsored.

## U.S. suspends contracts while probing Dutch firm

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States has suspended weapons contracts between American suppliers and Delft Instruments, a Dutch company the U.S. government suspects of illegally shipping night vision equipment to Iraq, according to federal and corporate officials.

The Pentagon is investigating how Iraq obtained night vision equipment, which contained sensitive parts manufactured by Hughes Aircraft Co. of Los Angeles. Hughes sold sensors to Delft, which is based in a Netherlands town of the same name.

The U.S. has informed the Dutch government that all munitions licenses to Delft have been suspended, said a U.S. official familiar with the case.

A "considerable amount of night vision equipment" was shipped to Iraq through a Delft subsidiary in Belgium, as well as through other sources, said the official, speaking on condition of anonymity.

The Dutch company has denied wrongdoing. Hughes is not accused of any violation.

Delft equipment was found at Khafji, a Saudi Arabian town where Iraqi troops engaged the allies in the first ground fighting of the Persian Gulf War, the official said.

The Iraqis' night fighting at Khafji surprised some allied commanders because they believed the Saudis' Hussein's troops had only limited night vision capability.

The allies say their night vision equipment is far superior to the Iraqis'.



**Move to dump Yeltsin afoot in Soviet Union**

MOSCOW (AP) — Three years after his criticism of Mikhail Gorbachev got him fired from the ruling Politburo, Boris Yeltsin may have jeopardized his job as president of the Russian republic by criticizing the Soviet president.

The populist firebrand, elected president last May, templed fate again Tuesday by escalating his criticism and urging Gorbachev to resign for allegedly seeking a dictatorship.

Yeltsin's appeal brought harsh condemnation from the national Supreme Soviet legislature and heightened calls in the Russian Federation legislature for a vote of no-confidence in Yeltsin.

Yeltsin made the bold appeal because he believed Gorbachev was blocking the radical steps he wants to reform the Russian Federation, the most populous of the 15 Soviet republics.

Six of the eight members of Russia's Supreme Soviet Presidium, the legislature's executive committee which Yeltsin heads, accused him of "authoritarianism" confrontation and an attempt to decide all ques-

tions of internal and external policy unilaterally.

The Presidium charged him with "neglect of the law and the opinion of constitutional organs."

Presidium members proposed an emergency session of the Supreme Soviet's larger, more powerful parent body — the Russian Congress of People's Deputies — to hear a report by Yeltsin about his actions.

Lawmakers said privately they expected the session to take a no-confidence vote.

The Congress also has the power to remove Yeltsin from the formal post as Presidium chairman that makes him de-facto republic president.

It's unclear how many deputies want to oust Yeltsin, but his support has waned since the Congress elected him president.

**Soldiers fire again to stop protesters**

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Soldiers fired warning shots Thursday to drive pro-democracy demonstrators out of an exclusive area where Albania's leaders live, and protesters burned books by Communist Albania's late founder.

It was the second time in two days in the Albanian capital, Tirana, that security forces fired in the air to disperse crowds seeking a break with the Stalinist past and a quick transition to democracy.

**Officials view privatization restitution bills**

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia (AP) — Parliament on Thursday approved the former East Bloc's most ambitious plan to return property nationalized by Communists to its previous owners.

The legislators then immediately moved on to another cornerstone of the government's plan to end its control over the economy — a bill to turn much of industry over to private hands.

As much as \$10.7 billion worth of property nationalized by the Communists after they took power in 1948 will be turned back to private owners under the so-called restitution bill approved Thursday. Finance Minister Vaclav Klaus was quoted as telling parliament.

About \$700 million would be paid in cash to original owners, the daily Lidove Noviny added. The remaining property would be returned in real-estate and in the form of government-issued bonds, the newspaper quoted Klaus as saying.



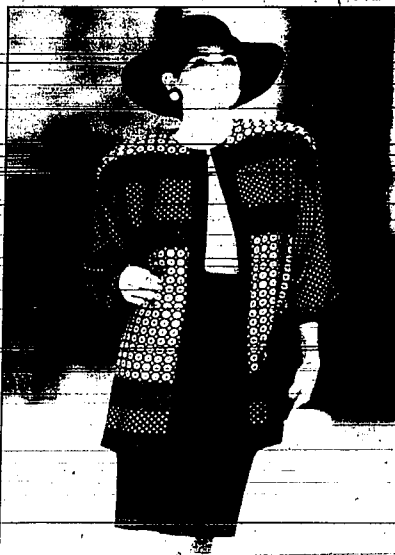

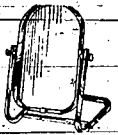
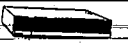

G-CSF, is a pioneer therapeutic product. While other biotechnological treatments have proved useful for only small numbers of patients, he said, a large number of cancer patients can benefit from G-CSF.

AIDS risk overrated, some say

ATLANTA (AP) — Groups ranging from the American Medical Association to the American Civil Liberties Union told federal officials Thursday that the risk of getting AIDS from a doctor doesn't warrant mandatory testing of health workers.

The first of two days of hearings on the issue by the National Commission for Disease Control brought out dozens of doctors, medical groups and political coalitions with opinions about what, if anything, should be done in the wake of the discovery that three Florida patients got the AIDS virus from their dentist.

Cracked hinges could threaten another launch

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — A delay in the shuttle's mission next month has been found on another space shuttle, NASA said Thursday.

An inspection of Columbia found that the aluminum hinges on the orbiter's main doors were cracked, said Lisa Malone, spokeswoman for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

# 5 more gas tax increase bills introduced

## Briefly

### GOP members renew schools support

BOISE — Republican lawmakers renewed their claim as the state's staunchest supporters of education Thursday when their majority on the budget committee approved a bill for public schools exceeding the amount proposed by Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus.

The \$484.5 million allocation for the coming school year, \$200,000 more than Andrus proposed, cleared the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee on a 14-10 party-line vote. Democrats backed an alternative that called for \$100,000 less than the governor proposed because it earmarked portions of the money for special projects.

The committee majority spent days holding the line on other agency spending to put itself in that position while still staying in line with a 1992 revenue estimate \$14 million below the one Andrus based his financial blueprint on.

"We're in pretty good shape for the rest of the budget," Senate Finance Chairman Atwell Parry, R-Melba, said. But while the panel's 7.6 percent increase in state support was greater than the governor's plan, it fell far short of the 16 percent boost sought by an education coalition led by State Schools Superintendent Jerry Evans. Evans remained as pessimistic about the legislative effort as he was about the governor's recommendation.

### Meridian officials study Bible giveaways

MERIDIAN — Meridian school officials are taking a second look at whether to allow distribution of Old Testament Bibles to pupils after two families filed complaints with the American Civil Liberties Union. "We don't know what the end result will be," Darlene Fulwood, the district's director of elementary education, said Wednesday. "We're working with our attorney."

A decision might come within two weeks, she said. For years, Fulwood said, Old Testament Bibles have been available to elementary pupils who want to go to their school libraries to get one from a Gideon.

### Work camp opponents ask judge to help

ST. ANTHONY — Opponents of a minimum-security prison work camp in St. Anthony are asking a district court judge to determine why inmates are still housed at the camp.

On Feb. 17, 7th District Court Judge Ted Wood issued an injunction prohibiting the city of St. Anthony from leasing the old hospital in town to the Idaho Department of Corrections as the work camp.

The motions are the latest in a lawsuit filed by Elaine and Votis Fisher to remove the camp from the street from their home.

A hearing has been scheduled March 11 in district court on motions by the state seeking a stay and asking Wood to amend his judgment.

### Woman pleads guilty in prostitution case

COEUR D'ALENE — A Washington state woman has pleaded guilty to a charge that she helped run a prostitution ring in Spokane County, Wash., and Kootenai County, Idaho.

Under terms of a plea agreement, prosecutors Wednesday dismissed an additional prostitution charge against Lindsey Gibbs, 39, in exchange for her guilty plea to conspiring to procure for prostitution.

Prosecutors allege that Gibbs and her husband, Donald C. Gibbs, 56, used an escort service as a front for a prostitution ring they operated from their home in Spokane, Wash.

Douglas said Lindsey Gibbs told an undercover officer that she had been in the prostitution business 18 years but had never been caught. He said he will ask that she, like her husband, be given a suspended three-year prison sentence.

First District Court Judge Gary Haman set sentencing for March 25. Lindsey Gibbs remains in the Kootenai County Jail in lieu of \$50,000 bail.

### Former-Ricks president dies at 85

REXBURG — John L. Clarke, former president of eastern Idaho's Ricks College, died Wednesday of natural causes. He was 85.

Clarke was president of the Mormon-owned college from 1944 to 1971. His 27-year tenure was the longest of any Ricks president. In his administration, the school swelled from 400 students and two buildings to 5,000 pupils and 24 buildings.

Ricks was made into a four-year school during Clarke's tenure, but the third and fourth years later were discontinued.

Clarke served as president of the LDS Church's New England Mission from 1972-74, president of the Rexburg Stake for nine years, and a trustee of the College Park Center. His wife, LaRae, continues to work at Ricks as an associate dean.

### Church group hears of Soviet threat

POCATELLO — While events in the Persian Gulf have dominated Americans' attention the past months, perhaps the greatest threat to global stability remains in the Soviet Union, a Pulitzer Prize winning columnist says.

Anthony Lewis, a two-time winner of the coveted prize and New York Times columnist, Wednesday addressed an Idaho State University audience for the Frank Church Symposium on International Affairs.

Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev is relying more on conservative factions of government; any semblance of democracy has fled the Chinese government; Eastern Europe faces serious economic and social strife; and the war in the Persian Gulf has shattered world peace.

The most important of these, in the long run, is the threat he sees remaining from the Soviet Union.

### Moscow man new education appointee

BOISE — Gov. Cecil Andrus has named Moscow attorney Roy Mosman to a five-year term on the Idaho State Board of Education, if confirmed by the state Senate. He will be Latah County's first representative on the eight-member panel since 1974.

Mosman, 58, is a former Nez Perce County prosecutor and 2nd District judge. He will succeed Coeur d'Alene lawyer J. Ray Cox, whose term on the board expires March 1.

Mosman, a Republican, is the father of Latah County Prosecutor Craig Mosman, a Moscow Democrat. Craig won a seat in the Idaho Senate last fall but gave it up as a result of health problems.

BOISE (AP) — The House Transportation and Defense Committee will have no shortage of bills to consider if members want to raise taxes to generate more highway construction money.



The committee on Wednesday approved introduction of four more bills increasing Idaho's 18-cent per gallon fuel tax and one boosting the sales tax for highway purposes.

The measures would generate up to \$73 million per year for state and local highway agencies.

The panel is considering Gov. Cecil Andrus' package of motor vehicle tax increases which together raise \$63.3 million per year in additional revenue for highway purposes.

But Chairman Rep. John Sessions

members. Sessions they didn't even want to consider a proposal boosting the fuel tax by 5 cents per gallon starting April 1.

"I wouldn't want the end of the session to come without having a choice," joked Rep. Mike Stimpson, R-Blackfoot, as he moved for introduction of a bill boosting the fuel tax by 3 cents per gallon April 1 and by another 2 cents in 1992.

If it becomes law, and no other state changes its fuel tax, Idaho would have the highest motor fuel tax in the nation, Department of Transportation official Hugh Lydston said.

The vote was 7-6 to introduce the measure.

Also approved for introduction was a bill boosting the fuel tax by 4 cents

per gallon; one setting the tax at 20 cents in April and 22 cents five years later and a 3-cent per gallon increase. But the largest tax increase could come from a bill sponsored by Rep. Claude Judd, D-Orofino. It calls for a 1-cent increase in the state sales tax to 6 percent.

That would generate \$73 million per year. Judd said his measure would be in effect only for 24 months, and after that, the sales tax would drop back to 5 percent.

"As bad as our roads and bridges are, this bill would be a fair way to deal with it," Judd said.

Idaho historically has funded highway activities through the fuel tax. Judd said dedicating sales tax revenue was a new idea for Idaho, but is use it other states.

The vote to introduce that measure was 85-5.

## Andrus, Gardner vow to cooperate on regional solution to salmon issues

BOISE (AP) — Gov. Cecil Andrus and Washington Gov. Booth Gardner pledged Thursday to work with the governors of Oregon and Montana toward a regional plan for restoring dwindling Northwest salmon runs.

"The governors of the four states are going to have to take a personal and strong participatory stand in the solution," Andrus said after meeting with Gardner for more than an hour in Boise.

"A regional solution to this issue is extremely important," agreed Gardner, who met earlier Thursday with Oregon Gov. Barbara Roberts. "We can either be a part of the solution or we can have it done to us."

The National Marine Fisheries Service is considering petitions from Indian tribes and conservation groups for federal protection for five species of salmon in the Columbia and Snake river systems.

To ensure states' interests are protected, Andrus and Gardner said the governors would cooperate in using data from the "salmon summit" meetings organized by Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., as well as information gathered by their own staffs, to develop an alternative plan for federal officials.

To implement whatever plan they develop, he and Gardner said they would seek to use the Northwest Power Planning Council, the eight-member regional planning authority for power and wildlife is appointed by the governors of Idaho, Oregon, Montana and Washington.

It has been accused of filling a largely advisory role in the past, but Andrus said it could be important in carrying out any salmon-recovery plan as the only group directly responsible to elected officials.

Either they do as they're requested or they can be replaced," he said.

Gardner said Washington and others have plans of their own at one stage or another of development, but acknowledged that the "Idaho Plan" had become the focus of debate on the issue.

Andrus' plan was outlined in a letter dated last Friday to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. It calls for drawing down reservoirs behind Lower Granite, Little Goose, Lower Monumental and Ice Harbor dams 10 feet

below minimum operating levels to create a current that would help speed young salmon downstream toward the Pacific Ocean.

## Committee passes local option tax bill

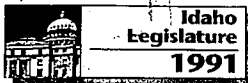
**BOISE** — The House Revenue and Taxation Committee passed a local-option tax bill on Thursday.

Twin Falls City Manager Tom Courtney said he was pleased with the bill's passage, although he could not predict if it would ultimately become law.

"We believe very strongly as a city that people in the community ought to have the right to vote on the type of taxes they want to support local services," Courtney said.

Courtney, Twin Falls Mayor Tom Condie and City Councilwoman Mary McCleskey, have attended the committee hearings as supporters of local-option taxes, an idea which has revisited the Legislature for almost all of the last 16 sessions.

The bill, which would allow cities and



counties to impose local sales taxes or vehicle registration fees on a 55 percent majority vote of the community, passed the committee on a 10-8 vote.

Under the legislation, no tax could be imposed for more than 10 years and any tax could be repealed on another 55 percent majority vote.

From the Magic Valley, Chairman Steve Antone, R-Rupert, and Rep. Jim Kempton, R-Albion, supported passage. Rep. Celia Gould, R-Buhl, voted against the bill.

She said she preferred another local option tax bill that has not been voted on yet,

but that would allow cities or counties flexibility to impose a sales tax on selective items.

Rep. Phil Childers, R-Boise, said local taxing authority would infringe on the state's ability to raise funds and would create a "nightmare" for businesses that operate in more than one tax jurisdiction.

And Rep. Golden Linford, R-Rexburg, said local sales taxes would be paid by people from out of town who didn't vote for the tax, and he argued that local-option taxes wouldn't decrease property taxes as supporters say. Rep. Michael Simpson, R-Blackfoot, warned that allowing local communities the ability to tax would be irreversible.

Resort communities, he said, would fight any attempt to rescind their resort tax. "Even if it's a bad idea, the opportunity to repeal it is essentially lost," Simpson said.

Blu Democratic Rep. Albert Johnson of

Pocatello — who said his hometown was one of the "pothole capital" of Idaho — said the local-option tax is a tool to help cities solve their financial problems.

Courtney said the Twin Falls City Council is committed to using the local-option tax authority to reduce property taxes.

He said local-option taxes exist in at least 29 other states.

He originally was charged with five misdemeanors and one felony assault charge after police allegedly found 2 pounds of plastic explosives in his car. Police stopped Moralez Feb. 10 after receiving a call that he had pointed a gun at a Cassia County resident.

### Newcomb's audit legislation sails through House vote

**BOISE** — Rep. Bruce Newcomb's bill to create a process for performance audits of state agencies passed the House on Thursday.

"It's time we do performance audits on agencies to determine if costs are legitimate," Newcomb, a Burley Republican, said. "It's not needed because in government there's no incentive to be efficient."

The legislation would create a joint legislative oversight committee, comprised of an equal number of senators and representatives, Democrats and Republicans.

The committee would direct an analyst to audit state agencies to check on fiscal and administrative management.

### Wendell slates recycle day for Saturday until noon

**WENDELL** — Saturday is recycle day for the month of February in Wendell. From 9 a.m. until noon, items for recycling will be collected at Elmo's Repair Shop at 640 F. Ave. W.

Newspapers, glass, plastic containers and minimum cans are collected by the Wendell Parent-Teacher Association and then hauled to a recycling company in Twin Falls by local volunteers.

Steve Kaehler, an organizer of the project, said there has been some "real growth" since collection began in October.

"Judging from the number of new faces I saw last time, word is getting around," he said.

Also, Kaehler said, people are learning the processes of sorting plastics by number and sorting glass by color. They are rinsing glass containers and removing metal caps, he said, and slick magazines are separated from newspapers.

## Israel's restraint sign of U.S. kinship

**TWIN FALLS** — An expert on the politics of Israel says the Jewish state's restraint in retaliating against Iraq for Scud missile attacks reflects the values Israel shares with the United States.

"I think it's remarkable that Israel has been willing to sacrifice so much to assist the American war effort," said University of Utah professor Harris Lenowitz Thursday. "Being willing to take the kind of punishment

Israel has been taking day after day without doing anything about it because it might hurt the American soldiers in the Arabian desert ... it's almost like being willing to be hurt to protect a member of your family."

Lenowitz was the third speaker in the Snake River Symposium lecture series, sponsored by the College of Southern Idaho honors program. Its focus this winter is "America and its relationship with the peoples of the Middle East."

"Israel and the United States are not just bound by their economic relationship, although that's important, or their political relationship," he said. "There's a spiritual relationship that exists between the Old Testament and the ideas of democracy. We're one people with one vision."

Israel has been attacked by more than three dozen Soviet-designed, medium-range, Scud ballistic missiles fired from western Iraq since the Gulf War broke out on Jan.

## State water boss sees salmon showdown looming

**TWIN FALLS** — Young salmon don't swim downstream when they migrate to the ocean in the spring.

They essentially back their way to the sea, swimming upstream against the current, then eventually wash them down the Snake and Columbia rivers, said Keith Higginson, director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources, on Thursday. That's why they get disoriented when they reach the slack

water reservoirs. Out-of-state interests have suggested contributing Idaho's irrigation water to create enough current through the reservoirs of the Columbia system to keep the fish oriented until they reach the ocean.

The hydroelectric dams that hinder fish migration have wiped out some salmon streams and brought others to the edge of extinction, Higginson told an energy and agriculture workshop at the College of Southern Idaho.

Petitions filed by the Shoshone-Bannock

Tribes, sportsmen and environmental groups to place more species of salmon on the federal endangered species list have brought Idaho water-users up against downstream power and navigation interests.

"Fish and environmental interests are now looking upstream for the water to flush fish through the slack-water dams," Higginson said.

The Pacific Northwest Utilities Conference Committee has suggested that all water in Snake River reservoirs should be

available in search of a solution, he said. That the fish need to reach the ocean is sufficient current to keep them oriented, Higginson said. Running additional water over hydroelectric dams would create this effect, but it would take a tremendous amount of water, he said.

"The whole matter is there is plenty of water to move the fish from the Salmon and Clearwater river watersheds in Idaho to the ocean if it were not for the presence of the dams," Higginson said.

## Expert: Irrigation system improvements cost-efficient

**TWIN FALLS** — Irrigation system improvements can easily pay for themselves in reduced energy costs, according to an official of the Idaho Department of Water Resources.

With inefficient systems farmers pay for the power to pump water but don't get it on the fields, said Quentin Nesbitt of the department's energy division Thursday.

He spoke to an energy and agriculture workshop at the College of Southern Idaho. Nesbitt cited two examples of farmers saving money by installing properly sized pumps and replacing worn or improper pipe.

One farmer in the Eagle area replaced a main pipeline, which allowed him to replace a 50-horsepower pump with a 30-horsepower pump. The changes saved \$1,870 in energy costs, while supplying the same pressure on the field.

Another farmer in American Falls replaced \$1,450 in energy saving in a season. By removing a pressure-reducing valve and replacing an improper section of pipe, he was able to operate the system at a reduced pressure and still supply the right amount of water to his crops.

The department offers free irrigation sys-

tem testing for efficiency, Nesbitt said. The federal Soil Conservation Service also offers help to irrigators with problems or questions, he said.

Ray Winn, an agricultural engineer with Idaho Power Co., said audits of 70 systems in the Burley, Rupert and Oakley areas showed a potential energy savings of nearly 4 million kilowatt hours.

Repairing leaks, installing the correct pump size to avoid having to partially close control valves and other efficiency improvements could save up to \$133,565 for 61 of the 70 systems, Winn said. That translates to about \$2,200 per irrigator.

With the irrigation system coming and no rain clouds on the horizon, irrigators may be faced with lower-than-normal irrigation water supplies.

Allan Humphreys of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Research Service may have an answer for reducing the water needed for furrow irrigation.

A system known as surge irrigation can increase irrigation efficiency by alternating the water from one set of furrows to another.

"With the same volume of water, you can wet twice as many furrows," Humphreys said.

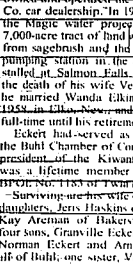

# Ketchum moves to ease housing crunch

KETCHUM - In another move to facilitate low-cost housing, the City Council has changed an ordinance that previously prevented planned unit developments, or PUDs on lots smaller than three acres.

PUDs are housing developments planned and designed as a unit such as apartments, townhouses or condominiums.

The new regulations will open up possibilities for developers and owners of vacant lots, including "at least one project" that is waiting to get started, according to Mayor Larry Young.

In order to qualify under the new regulations, a development will be required to include a minimum of 30 percent of its space for "employee or low-cost" housing.

As defined by the amendment, low-cost housing means that the rental cost will not exceed 33 percent of the median Blaine County income of the selling price will not

exceed 80 percent of the median Blaine County sale price.

City Planner Bethann Skarns said "one project of 28 units is currently being negotiated. But she said she is not sure at this point whether any of the units will be rentals.

If this latest effort produces some rental units, it could be important news to the many local folks unable to find affordable housing in Ketchum.

City Administrator Jim Jaquet has

said "there have been no significant apartment projects built in Ketchum in the last 10 years."

Turning to other matters, the council listened to Mayor Young express concern over the Transportation Department's Highway 75 project north of town.

The council has supported the project to date but local opposition, based on environmental and aesthetic concerns, has been strong.

No official change of the council's position was proposed, but as he circulated photos of a similar project in Montana, Young questioned the necessity of the project's 22-foot recovery zones.

Young noted that he is "going to write a letter" to the Transportation Board.

"I just want them to be able to deal with revegetation and the waiver of clear zones," he said.

Young ended his remarks by saying that he will write the letter "on my own behalf."

But he indicated that if the council likes the letter, it can be signed by

the council.

In other business, the council authorized Mayor Young to discuss Ketchum's gasoline prices with the Idaho attorney general's office. The council was acting on a complaint voiced by Mary Cogswell on the possibility of price collusion.

Requested the Ketchum Planning and Zoning Commission to begin consideration of conditional use necessary apartments in Limited Residential Zones.

The next zoning commission meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. Feb. 25, and the next "Housing Summit" between the council, the zoning commission and the Ketchum Housing Authority will be held March 1.

# Housing program aims to help homeless

TWIN FALLS - The Idaho Housing Agency and the Idaho Migrant Council have embarked on a joint effort to rehabilitate 24 council-owned housing units in the Twin Falls area for use by the homeless.

"We see a need for the homeless," said David Ramirez, Twin Falls housing manager for the Idaho Migrant Council. "Right now there is no place in Twin Falls

to house them."

The housing agency's board of commissioners approved the contract with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The contract for \$780,000, which will be administered by the Idaho Housing Agency, will go to the migrant council over a 10-year period in the form of rental assistance payments to handle the mortgage, insurance, construction, management and utility costs.

# House panel OKs legislation which would legalize pinball, other games

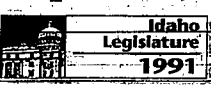

BOISE - The House State Affairs Committee on Thursday introduced and sent to the floor legislation cleaning up Idaho's definition of gambling to exclude pinball machines and video games.

"All we're asking to do is allow these types of amusement entertainment games to be legal and be allowed to be played," said Rep. Celia Gould, R-Buhl, who is sponsoring the measure for the Amusement and Music Owners Association.

Under existing law, games that offer money, credit or representative of values - including pinball or Pac Man - are illegal.

Three bars in Orofino with video poker games that the Dept. of Law Enforcement this past fall. Players were able to



exchange credit for free games for money, and law enforcement officials suspended the bars' liquor licenses, said Monte MacConnell, deputy director of the Department of Law Enforcement.

The action "caused quite a furor," MacConnell said, and bar owners around the state contacted their legislators.

While the department could confiscate the machines, it has no intention of doing so, MacConnell said. "We support the change. I agree that... the law doesn't make a lot of sense," he said.

Gould's bill would legalize "any game, scheme or device for enter-

tainment or amusement" that requires skill to play and which awards additional play. Gambling would be considered any game, scheme or device in which the elements of chance, consideration and prize is present.

Whether or not it takes a skill to play poker, the card game would be illegal when played for a reward, Gould said.

Commercial bingo, also, would be illegal under the proposed bill, though some people may want to legalize the game, Gould said. "This deals only with amusement devices. That's all it exempts out."

Rep. John Alexander, D-Fossil, said many small businesses in his area have been threatened that their machines might be confiscated.

"I think this will help our small business," he said.

# GOP proposal shifts indigent burden to state

BOISE (AP) - Ignoring a threatened gubernatorial veto and the negative impact on their 1992 spending plans, Senate Republicans on Thursday sent Gov. Cecil Andrus an \$11.5 million plan shifting the burden of indigent medical costs from counties to the state.

"It's a responsibility of every one in this state to help these people," Health and Welfare Chairman Rex Funness, R-Rigby, said. "It's a responsibility we cannot deny."

The vote was 22-20 with Michael Blackbird of Coeur d'Alene the lone Democrat supporting the measure that has been at the center of a political battle for the hearts of Idaho's property taxpayers.

Democrats backed the governor's less expensive alternative that the administration maintained would provide as much, if not more, property tax relief as the legislative proposal, while getting the federal government to pick up the bulk of the bill. After inter-party attempts to negotiate a compromise failed, Democrats, including Blackbird, lost a bid to open the bill to modifications that would have reduced its cost to the state for 1992. It failed when GOP Lt. Gov. Butch Otter broke a 21-21 partisan tie by voting against changes.

## New Kids don't disappoint area fans

### 'Blockaholics' get their fix at concert in Boise

The countdown continued: just two hours until the New Kids on the Block concert. Excitement—and a cloud of hairspray—filled the air in a women's bathroom on the Boise State University campus. A half-dozen girls crowded in front of the mirrors, checking their makeup and chattering about the day they never thought would arrive.

About 10,000 fans—including a Magic Valley contingent of 150 or more—packed the BSU Pavilion for the teen heroes' concert Sunday. The house was nearly sold out at \$25 a ticket, although many seats behind the stage remained vacant.

Tina Leedom, 15, and Charity Weaver, 16, of Twin Falls, stood by in the restroom, waiting for the rest of their group. For them, the New Kids' first Idaho appearance was a dream come true.

After trying in vain to buy good tickets when they went on sale last fall, Tina won tickets from a radio station just last week. She and Charity stayed up late Saturday night crafting a poster sporting the message "NKOTB #1" and a peace sign.

Serious New Kids fans are sometimes known as Blockheads. "But we're worse—we're Blockaholics," Tina said.

For both, it was their first concert. "Anything they do will be fine with us," Charity said.

Although the arena acoustics muddled the Kids' sound somewhat, the show was a spectacle. Sirens blared, flash pots erupted and fireworks exploded as the New Kids ran onstage.

Screams and calls of "we love you" greeted their arrival. Surprisingly, however, and mercifully for the earplugging parents in the audience, the shrieks didn't last during every song.

The Massachusetts-based Kids—who range in age from 18 to 22—performed for more than an hour, each young man taking his turn in the spotlight on hits including "Hangin' Tough" and "Step By Step." The guys scrambled all over the multi-level stage, treating it like a piece of playground equipment and giving even those fans in back a view.

Much of the Kids' star appeal stems from their good looks and their music, a blend of bubble gum pop and blue-eyed soul with a little rap thrown in. Many fans also applaud the Kids' stands against drugs, prejudice and war.

The biggest crowd pleasers seemed to be Jordan Knight, with his matinee idol looks and falsetto voice, and Donnie Wahlberg, the group's resident rebel and ringleader.

But the other Kids drew raves, too—Joe McIntyre for his singing, Danny Wood for his break-dancing, and extra-cute Jonathan Knight just for showing up.

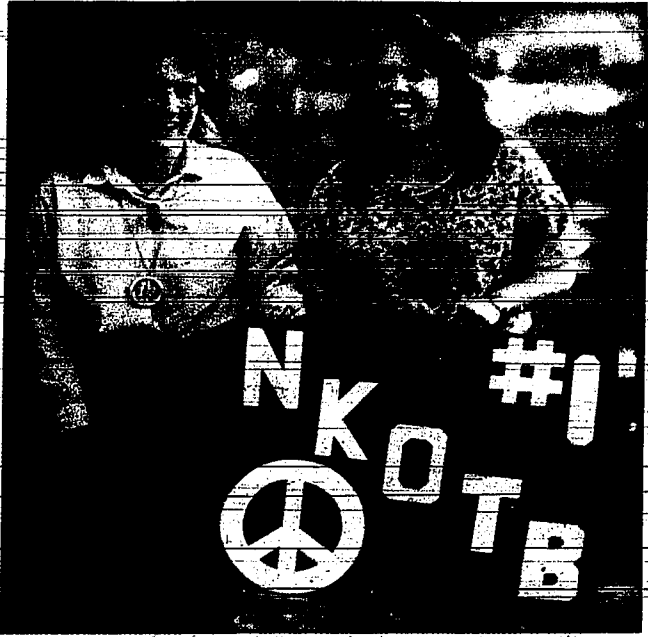
For many—including the Wiersema of Jerome—the concert was a family affair, with even 3-year-old Liz on hand for the big show. Eleven-year-old Marsha sported a black jacket festooned with 43 New Kids buttons.

Marsha has more Kids memorabilia at home. "Her room is wallpapered with New Kids photos; her mother Cindy said, 'Wall to wall,'" added Kurt, Marsha's father.

Barbara Hawker and Dee Otto of Twin Falls escorted their sons to the event. Randy Hawker, 10, explained that his favorite New Kid is Joe and his favorite tune "Funky Funky Christmas."

"He sang it all the way up here," Barbara said. "It drove us funky funky crazy."

The New Kids—who have sold more than 20 million records—rarely occasionally buy-across camp synchronizing their songs in concert. Fifteen-year-old fans

Ashley Rader and Amy Stevens, both of Gooding, had second row seats and said they didn't think the guys were faking it.

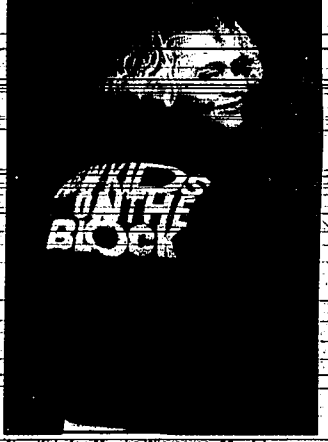
But both said it wouldn't have mattered even if they were. "They could have gone up there and sang 'Howdy Doody' for all we cared," Ashley said.

## Mel Tillis, The Statesiders visit Jackpot for 2 nights

JACKPOT, — Stuttering his way to the top, country artist Mel Tillis is famous for writing and singing such hits as "I Believe in You," "Coca Cola Cowboy," "I Got The Hoss," and "What Did I Promise Her Last Night?"

But fans know he also has written more than 1,000 songs, of which more than 500 have been recorded.

Tillis songs made famous by other artists include "Detroit City" by Bobby Bare; "Burning Memories" by Ray Price; "Honey Open That Door" by Ricky Skaggs; "I Ain't Never" by Webb Pierce; "Life Turned Her That Way" by Harlan Howard; and "Ruby, Don't Take Your Love To Town" by Kenny Rogers.

In a recent press release, Tillis said many of his songs are taken from personal experiences.

"I knew Ruby," Tillis said. "The story is about a GI in World War II and he met this girl in England at one of the hospitals. He brought her to Pabokke, Florida (Mel's hometown), and moved in behind our house in an alley. It was called Cat Alley 'cuz there was so many cats there. "One time he went for treatment for his wounds and he got arip or something, and he was paralyzed temporarily. I used to hear them over there arguin'. Gawd-a-mighty, he used to accuse her of everything. She'd come over to our house crying. She put up with that for a long, long time, and I guess she finally decided, 'Well, if he's going to accuse me of it, I might as well do it.' About four years later, he killed himself and her too."



Mel Tillis wrote more than 1,000 songs

Born Aug. 8, 1932, Tillis began stuttering at age 3 after a bout with malaria. All people who stutter or stammer can sing, Tillis said. While singing, they do not repeat themselves, he explained, and speech pathologists even use singing as a therapy for their patients.

"I think it's the beat, the rhythm and also the identity," Tillis said. "When I'm in front of the microphone I become Mel Tillis the Singer—almost like being an other person—and that person doesn't stutter."

He joined the Air Force in 1951 and served for four years, but he worked as a baker—his father's trade—after being discharged. "The Air Force doesn't need stuttering pilots."

While stationed on Okinawa, Japan, Tillis joined a band and entertained weekends and evenings in local military clubs.

Back home, he worked as a strawberry picker, a fire fighter on the Atlantic Coastal Line Railroad, a milkman and a delivery driver for a cookie company.

Although he has received country music's highest honor of Entertainer of the Year in 1976 and has been inducted into the Songwriter's Hall of Fame; Tillis was once told he couldn't make it in the entertainment business because of his speech impediment.

In 1956, Webb Pierce recorded "I'm Tired," a song Tillis wrote in a Florida strawberry patch after traveling to Nashville and being rejected as a recording artist.

The next year, Tillis moved to Nashville to sell his songs and sing back-up in the shadow of other stars.

After forming his own band, Tillis entertained for six years without opening his mouth onstage except to sing. But friends Minnie Pearl and Glen Campbell urged Mel to talk to his audience, stutter and all.

"I was scared to death," Tillis recalled. "But I did it and from that time on, my career went uphill all the way."

Drawing crowds hasn't been much of a problem for Tillis, having been named the Country Music Association's "Comedian of the Year" from 1971 through 1976. But it is something else that he credits with his continued success.

"I've got a great band," he said. "It's a three band—14 pieces. I don't see nothing against polyester—in galardinne and kangaroo boots."

The Statesiders, named for the 1963 Tillis hit "Stateside," tour in luxury buses to meet their boss, who usually catches plane to commute from Tennessee. Country Rhodes, a two woman, one man trio, joined the show in July.

Tillis is on the road 250 days per year performing in Nevada showrooms, making television appearances and running his own music company.

"I love to perform," he said. "I worked so hard to get there, might as well enjoy it."

The latest Mel Tillis Fan Club letter says the star's new songs are "We Need To Walk" and "She Didn't Let The Ink Dry on the Paper." A live album is ready for release and another album will follow soon.

Mel and Mel Tillis Jr. perform together with the Statesiders through the summer tourist season at an Ozark theater in Branson, Mo.

Other hit songs written and sung by Tillis include "New Patches," "All No California," "Send Me Down To Tucson," "All The Time," "Stomp Them Grapes," "Mental Revenge," "Heart Over Mind," "In The Middle Of The Night," "After All This Time," "Good Woman Blues," "Heart Healer," "Blind In Love," "Texas Cowboy Night," "Steppin' Out," "Memory Maker" and "Lyn Time Again."

# Bang on head may have killed Mozart

NEW YORK (AP) — A French scholar believes Mozart died of a head injury, not rheumatic fever or poisoning as many thought.

The conclusion by anthropologist Pierre-Francois Puch of the University of Provence resulted from his finding a fracture in the skull believed to have been the composer's, *Archaeology* magazine reports in its March issue.

The magazine said Mozart was known to have begun suffering severe headaches in the spring of 1790, more than a year before his death.

Puch said the fracture, of the left temple, may have been the result of a fall.

Puch found indications that the fracture caused chronic bleeding

that might well account for Mozart's headaches, weakness and fainting that culminated in his coma and subsequent death Dec. 5, 1791, the magazine said.

Standard references attribute the composer's death, at the age of 35 to a return of rheumatic fever he suffered in childhood, combined with excessive bloodletting, a common medical practice at the time.

# National Endowment for the Arts head denies any damage from obscenity battle

WASHINGTON (AP) — John F. Frohnmayer, chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, bristled at suggestions that last year's decision to deny alleged federal support for obscene art had damaged his agency and the prestige of its grants.

To the notion that the endowment "is weakened or its grants being smirched," he said, "I reject that categorically."

Testifying at a House Appropriations subcommittee hearing on the NEA's proposed \$174 million budget for next year, Frohnmayer responded heatedly to published criticism of his leadership of the federal arts agency.

Rep. Sidney Yates, D-Ill., the panel's chairman, read a commentary published Dec. 23 by the Los Angeles Times in which arts activist June Wayne said the NEA controversy "has left us with a gravely damaged institution."

She wrote that "NEA grants can no longer be taken seriously" because they had "lost their professional prestige." She expressed

doubts about Frohnmayer's ability to shield the agency's grant-making decisions from "political manipulation."

Frohnmayer dismissed Wayne's comments as "careless" and "uninformed."

Yates, a longtime backer of federal support for the arts, expressed concern that the obscenity debate might have damaged the NEA's morale and made it afraid to subsidize potentially controversial works in the future.

Under questioning by Yates, Frohnmayer and several of his aides denied they felt intimidated by congressional criticism.

After a heated debate last fall, Congress repealed an earlier ban on federal support for obscene works and voted to leave obscenity judgments to the courts. Instead, it required the NEA chairman to consider "general standards of decency" when making grant awards.

Frohnmayer promised that the endowment "absolutely will adhere to the whole law," but he declared

again, "I will not be the decency czar of this country."

He said compliance with the new decency standard would be assured by revamping the NEA's future grant review panels to make sure their members reflect a broad diversity of ethnic, cultural and geographic interests.

The White House rejected Frohnmayer's request for a \$212 million budget in the next fiscal year, which starts Oct. 1, and instead asked Congress to freeze the NEA's spending at its current level of \$174 million.

Under a shift in agency funds ordered by Congress, Frohnmayer said, the NEA lost nearly \$12 million in federal grant funds that were diverted to state arts agencies to use at their discretion.



# Overproduction ruins 'Sleeping With the Enemy'

**SLEEPING WITH THE ENEMY** (R) A solid book has been inflated by overproduction and underwriting into thin melodrama to make a vehicle for Julia Roberts, playing an abused wife who tries to begin her life again. Patrick Bergin, as the villainous Sir Richard Burton in "Mountains of the Moon," is even more so here as her menacing husband. It's another fair tale for Roberts; wife abuse being seen here so many times in Hollywood Boulevard hooker in "Pretty Woman," and she attacks this role with the same bland compliance and dazzling superficial warmth.

**KINDERGARTEN COP** (PG-13) The gentling of Arnold Schwarzenegger's role as a studded, lone-wolf cop with a taste for vicious vigilante tac-

tics, and gradually tamed into a family-loving pussycat by his undercover surveillance job as a kindergarten teacher. The last word in glib, shallow, soulless, spuriously warm-hearted commercialism. Director Ivan Reitman and the usual consortium of writers barely miss a trick or a marketing hook. Of all the recent "brilliant" movies — films that resemble elongated trailers — this may be the most fool-proof.

**DANCES WITH WOLVES** (PG-13) In his first directing work, Kevin Costner has made a clear-eyed, authentic vision of the frontier Northwest that is irresistible. The story of a Union officer who becomes assimilated with a tribe of Sioux, it has all the elements of epic: vastness, astonishing action sequences, exotic-looking characters but because it's more concerned with character than spectacle, its epic quality becomes engaging, never self-congratulatory. Beautiful, memorable and full of humor, it's one of the most winning films of the year.

# 'King Ralph' best when it turns less funny

"King Ralph" may do big business, but it won't be because it is a very special film. It is, in fact, a rather ordinary, almost trivial, movie, and Goodman, its biggest asset, may also be its biggest liability.

He has a comic image. As the television husband in Roseanne Barr on the Barr comedy series, he carries some baggage with him, enough to encourage the movie spectator to expect a little more of the film.

Promotion has something to do with this, too. The film has been promoted as a riotous comedy, and while it tries, it is best when it takes a turn for the serious. Well, not serious serious but certainly less comic.

"King Ralph" takes its less comic turn during the last half hour. That's when Ralph, an American contractor who became an English lord, realizes there are far nobler things to do than "rule" a kingdom.

This part of the film is actually rather touching, but that's jumping ahead. Before we get to that point, we are treated to the predictable spectacle of seeing an American entertainer (he plays piano in a Las Vegas club), adjust to the schedule he is expected to follow as the only

surviving member of the royal family. The rest have been blown up. This happens when they assemble for a group photograph and are accidentally electrocuted, "en masse. It sounds tasteless, but it works. It is done with just the right touch and is never as bad as what AGE Guinness did to the royal family in his "Kind Hearts and Coronets."

Goodman is personable, but then we already know that. Peter O'Toole is magnificent as the private secretary to the king. Camille Coduri is the commoner with whom Ralph falls in love, and John Hurt is the evil Lord Graves, who would like to be king himself. "King Ralph" is an inoffensive time passer, but that's about it.

# Merchandisers plan to reduce compact disc packaging slightly

Record merchandisers are pledging to inch away this year from the environmentally criticized cardboard packaging of compact discs. But only an inch in each direction.

The board of directors of the National Association of Record Merchandisers voted recently to endorse new packaging for compact discs that will be 5 by 11 inches, compared with the current "longboxes" that measure 6 by 12 inches.

"We're getting off our 6-by-12-inch kick," said Pam Horowitz, executive vice president of the association, in an interview from her office in Marlinton, N.J.

More important, the new cardboard package won't be thrown away. Instead it will be folded by consumers to the size of their conventional plastic CD cases, the so-called jewel-box format, which the new boxes will eventually replace.

With prototypes that satisfy both retailers and environmentally minded consumers, Horowitz said, "We hope to have our cake and eat it, too."

A statement drafted by the association urges record labels to "survive" a minimum amount of discarded material and a maximum amount of retained material" in their packages and calls for implementation before the end of 1991.

The longboxes became an embarrassment to performers who made socially conscious recordings and who appeared at environmental rallies but whose music came enclosed in a superfluous, bulky throwaway package twice as big as the product inside.

When some major artists got on the "Ban the Box" bandwagon last year, they won compact agreements that said their new albums wouldn't be in longboxes. But many U.S. retailers balked at new releases by Ruffi, the children's artist, and Peter Gabriel, refusing to stock them the way they are stocked everywhere else in the world—simply in their plastic jewel-box case with shrink-wrap around them.

As a result, Peter Gabriel's greatest hits album "Shaking the Tree" has yet to break the Top 50 six weeks after its release, although his last album hit No. 2. And Ruffi has failed to have the adult breakthrough he was hoping for.

U.S. retailers say that the oversized longboxes prevent easy shoplifting, provide greater surface space for luring the potential customer and—best of all—fit easily into racks built for the 12-by-12-inch vinyl record albums that CDs have virtually replaced since the beginning of the compact disc age seven years ago.

Retailers feared spending thousands of dollars in each store, on new fixtures to accommodate only the 5-by-9 1/2-inch jewelboxes, Horowitz said. She estimated costs of refixturing at \$5,000 to \$20,000 for each of the estimated 15,000 to 20,000 retail outlets in the United States.

A move to ban the longbox in Canada last year was "a disaster from the retailers' standpoint," she said.

Despite the grass-roots coalition Ban the Box, which urged consumers to leave the cardboard packaging at the stores in protest, Horowitz said, "In all honesty, consumers haven't been particularly vocal on this one. We're reacting to feedback from suppliers."

# Dreams turn into tragic nightmares as murder invades South Sea Island

By Bob Remington

Retiring early and sailing the South Seas in search of a deserted island paradise is the stuff of dreams. For Mac and Muff Gram, the dream became the ultimate nightmare.

In 1981, a skull identified as Muff's was found on the beach at Palmyra, an isolated atoll in the South Pacific. It had been burned by extreme heat, probably from an acetylene torch, and her body was dismembered and placed in a metal box. Mac Graham's body was never found.

Seven years earlier, the upper-middle-class yachting couple from San Diego had set out for Palmyra as part of a South Pacific voyage that they planned to last two years. Their boat, the elegant, well-stocked Sea Wind, later showed up in Hawaii with a young couple aboard.

The pair, Jennifer Jenkins and Buck Walker, an ex-con wanted on drug charges, were arrested for the theft of the Sea Wind and found guilty.

The Gramams had disappeared without a trace, but until Muff's skull was discovered on Palmyra, there had been no evidence of foul play. After the remains were found, Jenkins and Walker were charged with her murder.

This grisly tale, set against the exotic backdrop of the South Pacific, comes to the tube Sunday, Feb. 24, and Tuesday, Feb. 26, as "And the Sea Will Tell," a four-hour miniseries on CBS.

It caps a month of ratings-driven

TV mayhem that began with Brian Dennehy portraying a town bully killed by an angry mob in "In Broad Daylight" and continued with last week's lurid "Love, Lies and Murder."

"And the Sea Will Tell" is based on the book of the same title by Vincent Bugliosi, the famed prosecutor of the notorious Manson family and author of "Helter Skelter." Bugliosi, now a defense lawyer, represented Jennifer Jenkins on the murder charge, arguing that Walker — and Walker alone — had killed the Gramams without the knowledge or cooperation of Jenkins.

In Bugliosi's book, Jenkins is described as "5-foot-4-inches and, in truth, not the type to win a beauty contest." But for TV, a murder story set on a tropical-island paradise demands beautiful people to match the locale. Enter the statuesque

Rachel Ward as Jenkins, Hart Bochner as Buck Walker, swarthy James Brolin as Mac Graham and Dieder Hall as his wife, Muff. Bugliosi is portrayed by Richard Crenna.

The miniseries, filmed in Hawaii, Tahiti and Vancouver, British Columbia, deals at length with the courtroom maneuverings of the skilled Bugliosi, who argued his client's case in a five-hour summation — one hour longer than the entire miniseries. His case, said Bugliosi, involved getting the jury to believe some creative mathematics.

## 'Twin Peaks' pulled from ABC list

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Twin Peaks" has been pulled from the ABC schedule following this in what could be the first move toward cancellation of the bizarre television serial.

ABC said in a statement released that the "Twin Peaks" ratings were a disappointment but that the show would return to the air in a different time period later this season. Last week, "Twin Peaks" finished in 85th place out of 89 television shows ranked by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

A spokesman for the producers of the show said, "We have no idea when we will be on next." Traditionally, when a show is placed on indefinite hiatus its future is doomed.

Michael Saltzman, the spokesman

for "Twin Peaks" producers David Lynch and Mark Frost, said ABC has ordered 22 episodes of the one-hour drama for the 1990-91 television season.

Lynch, whose feature film credits include 1986's "Blue Velvet" and 1990's "Wild at Heart," was optimistic. "We've all known the true 'Twin Peaks' fan is a party animal and not home on Saturday night, and they have sorely missed the opportunity to have a party on a weeknight," Lynch said in a statement. "We are looking forward to seeing which weekday night ABC will call party night in the future," Lynch said.

Saltzman said "Twin Peaks" might perform better in a new time period. The remaining six episodes are in varying stages of completion.

Saltzman said, "All of us feel that Saturday night was not the night for 'Twin Peaks,'" Saltzman said. "We don't see this as a negative. We see this as a positive."

The show focuses on sex, murder and junk food in a Pacific Northwest lumber town. It stars Kyle MacLachlan as FBI Agent Dale Cooper, Michael Ontkean as Sheriff Harry S. Truman and Piper Laurie, Joan Chen and Mädchen Amick in supporting roles.

"Twin Peaks" was among the most promising television debuts in recent years when it premiered in April 1990, but its popularity with critics and audiences alike steadily has ebbed. ABC also said it would place the spy drama "Under Cover" on hiatus. "Under Cover" was seen Saturday nights at 9 p.m.

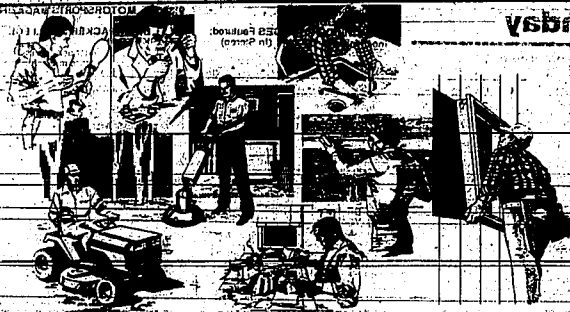
