House approves 3-cent increase in Gem fuel tax

BOISE — It soon could cost more to operate a motor vehicle in Idaho. After a 90-minute debate Thursday, the House voted 55-28 to boost the state fuel tax by 3 cents per gallon, effective April 1. Earlier in the day, the revenue and Taxation Committee released a measure calling for a voter referendum on boosting the fuel tax by another 1 1/2 cents per gallon to finance \$75 million for highway construction. The tax increase, which would apply to

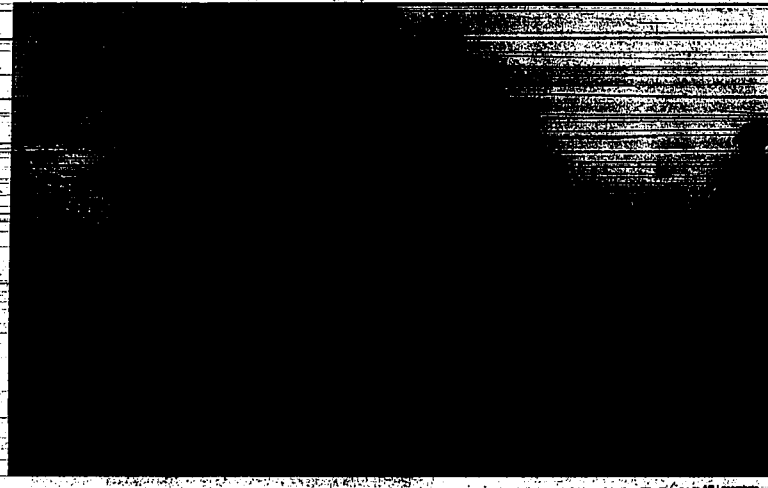
both diesel fuel and gasoline, would generate between \$17 million and \$18 million per year, which sponsors said is needed to gain on a package of highway projects. House members said if a motorist drives 12,000 miles per year and gets 20 miles per gallon, the 3-cent-per-gallon increase would cost an extra \$18 per year. House Republicans split almost evenly on the issue, but all Democrats voted for

Idaho Legislature 1991
The tax increase except Rep. John Gannon, D-Boise. The fuel tax question now goes to the Senate. The highway bond proposal is a referendum to be put before voters in November of next year, so it would not take effect until the 1993 Legislature opened in Sponsoring Sen. Herb Carlson, R-Eagle, said it will be put up for amendment to make it clearer that the state will share the additional revenue

with local highway agencies. If both taxes were to be approved, Idaho's fuel tax would be 22.25 cents per gallon. If no state surrounding Idaho increased its fuel tax, Idaho would be higher than all neighboring states except Washington, now at 23 cents per gallon. Gov. Cecil Andrus gave competing suggestions to the Legislature, but all have been rejected. The Transportation and Defense Committee rejected the governor's proposal to raise the fuel tax by 6 cents per gallon and double vehicle

Forces may be home by July 4

WASHINGTON — American troops began pouring home from the Persian Gulf Thursday, and Defense Secretary Richard B. Cheney said the pace of the withdrawal might bring all U.S. forces back in time for the July 4 celebration suggested by President Bush. Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams said that the U.S. prisoners released by Iraq would return "within the next few days, probably as early as Sunday." In a single flight to Andrews Air Force Base. After "some kind of ceremony," he said, the former prisoners would be examined at local hospitals and discharged for convalescent leave. Baghdad has released 21 American servicemen and women, and Williams said the

Pentagon does not believe the Iraqis are holding any more. The first wave of 5,188 returning troops — drawn from all four services and including both active duty forces and reserves — were scheduled to arrive Friday at home bases stretching from Fort Bliss, Tex., to Garlestedt, Germany. Many of the bases are planning homecoming celebrations. Post-war security arrangements in the gulf, he said, will probably include the "pre-positioning" of heavy equipment to permit U.S. mechanized and armored troops to return to the region rapidly without relying on seaborne transportation. But with Secretary of State James A. Cheney repeated previous predictions that in the future there would be more U.S. naval ships stationed in the gulf and more joint exercises involving American and Arab ground troops. He declined to discuss the scale or frequency of the exercises, but said they would not need to be continuous to convey American resolve. "I think U.S. credibility — our capacity to deploy large forces to take on all comers to win a major conflict, our will to do it — is today unchallenged," he said. "The successful prosecution of the war in the gulf has to give pause to would-be adversaries and be a source of great comfort to our friends and allies." Wary of disappointing anxious families and friends, Pentagon officials declined Thursday to provide a precise timetable for the exodus of troops from the gulf. But Cheney, in an interview with several reporters, said the withdrawal would continue at the rate of about 5,000 soldiers a day — unless "diplomatic developments" or renewed fighting interfered. With 40,000 troops in the gulf, that pace would bring everyone home within four months, just in time for Independence Day. Bush, in his Wednesday night address to a joint

Oil firefighters survey hot job ahead

KUWAIT CITY — American oil firefighters working near clouds of black, acrid smoke and roaring oil fires are assessing what the U.S. will take to restore Kuwait's oil facilities sabotaged by Iraq forces last month. Some say the bill could run as high as \$20 billion over 10 years. Kuwaiti oil officials estimated on Thursday that 189 million gallons a day — more than Britain uses — have been

lost from Kuwait's largest oil field since Iraqi forces blasted 400 of the field's 500 oil wells. They said the devastation began two days before the start of the Feb. 24 allied ground campaign that drove the Iraqis from Kuwait, when the Iraqis touched off explosive charges placed at each well. About 800 of Kuwait's 1,000 wells have been damaged, estimated Ahmed Murad, an executive of the state-owned Kuwait Oil Co. It could cost \$20 billion in the next five

or 10 years to restore all of Kuwait's fields and oil facilities, said Musab Al-Alyseem, head of an emergency-Kuwaiti task force formed to get the fields flowing again. They include the world's second-largest field, the Greater Burgan field located 25 miles south of Kuwait City. On Thursday, no fires had yet been put out, and officials of the state's oil company said many wells still have Iraqi and personnel mines around them.

Kuwaitis' turn to wait in lines for gasoline

KUWAIT CITY — It's a scene Americans would find rich in irony: hundreds of wealthy Arabs with gas-guzzling luxury cars waiting for hours in mile-long gasoline lines. The lines form at dawn before the service stations open, stretch around the corner, and are still there when many of the pumps run out of fuel at around midnight. "We never thought we'd see this," said Ahmed Darweesh as he sat in his white

Mercedes-Benz 280 waiting for a fillup. "A few days ago it took me more than three hours to get petrol." One shouldn't feel too sorry for Kuwaiti drivers. For the time being, all gasoline is free. Nonetheless, the lines are reminiscent of those American drivers faced during oil crises in the 1970s, when then-powerful OPEC (the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries) had tremendous influence over world oil supplies and prices. With some of the richest oil fields in

the world, Kuwait became a nation of car fanatics who considered it their birthright to have unlimited supplies of gasoline at the equivalent of 50 cents a gallon. Mercedes-Benzes, BMWs, Cadillacs, Corvettes, Porsches and Jaguars used to cruise along the beachfront Corniche in a never-ending display of the nation's affluence. Iraq's Aug. 2 invasion brought some rude surprises. Saddam Hussein's soldiers began stealing cars they fancied, doubled gas prices and refused gas to citizens who failed to change their Kuwaiti plates.

Quit coffee, lower blood pressure, researchers say

ATLANTA — Healthy men who drank three to six cups of coffee a day experienced a significant drop in blood pressure when they kicked the habit, researchers said Thursday. The researchers think the drop might be larger in people with high blood pressure, who should be advised to give up coffee, said one of the study's authors, Dr. Robert Superko of Stanford University. "Maybe this will help them prevent drug treatment" for high blood pressure, said the study's principal author, Jeff Mittleman of Stanford. It's worth noting that the findings were presented at the annual meeting of the American College

of Cardiology. The National Coffee Association said the drop in blood pressure was small and that other studies have shown no effect of coffee on blood pressure. "This study should not raise concern among coffee drinkers watching their blood pressure," the association said in a statement. But Superko said the fall in blood pressure was significant, and that it varied among the subjects in the study. "There are some people who went down profoundly," he said. He said many of the previous studies that found no effect of coffee on blood pressure were flawed because few patients demonstrated any effect, and thus their findings should be discarded.

Firm president sentenced for seed theft from BLM

TWIN FALLS — Globe Seed and Feed Co. president Larry McElliott has admitted embezzling from the Bureau of Land Management, and now must pay more than \$9,000 in restitution. McElliott, 53, pleaded guilty to stealing grass seed from the BLM and was sentenced in U.S. District Court in Boise recently. In addition to repaying the government, McElliott must pay \$5,979 in fines and serve three years probation beginning with four months of in-home detention. "Globe Seed and Feed Company, located at 222 Fourth Ave. S., is one of the area's largest seed dealers and has been in the family for 59 years," McElliott said

Thursday. The Federal Bureau of Investigation began investigating McElliott's business last year, filing two charges of embezzlement in September. One count was later dropped when McElliott pleaded guilty. According to former Globe Seed and Feed employees interviewed by the FBI, McElliott diverted certified seed away from batches to be mixed for the BLM and replaced them with non-certified seed and seed chaff. On Thursday, McElliott said the case against him was sparked by "disgruntled employees." He pleaded guilty on the basis of the anonymous and because he did not think he could win if the case went to trial, McElliott said.

Senate Rules Committee sets up campaign financing timetable

WASHINGTON (AP) — The chairman of the Senate Rules Committee moved Thursday to jumpstart legislation that could lead to changes in campaign financing, announcing the panel will begin drafting its bill March 20.

Sen. Wendell Ford's swift timetable came as Majority Leader George Mitchell told the panel it was a "high priority to break a

longstanding logjam on the political-charged issue."

"Our election finance system no longer has the confidence of the American people," said Mitchell, D-Maine. "The American people don't trust the process that gives such an advantage to incumbents over challengers."

Mitchell, Ford, D-Ky., and Sen. David Bonior, D-Okla., are the prime

sponsors of a Democratic bill that includes voluntary spending limits for Senate campaigns — an provision opposed by a number of Republicans.

GOP senators have said they agree with other Democratic provisions to ban political action committees; provide discounts for broadcast ads; prohibit political parties from using unregulated donations; and curb

abuses of "independent" expenditures; those supposedly made without consultation with the candidate.

A campaign finance bill failed to pass last year, but the leadership of both parties said the legislation was more urgent than ever because voter participation fell to 36 percent last fall.

Both parties criticize the advantage of incumbents, who have better

name recognition, usually outpace challengers by wide margins and win about 9 of 10 elections against challengers.

Ford, in a taste of the political hardball to come, said, "Every issue is on the table except spending limits."

Many GOP lawmakers, as minority members in both houses, believe spending limits would hinder party

challengers from knocking off Democratic incumbents.

Democrats, however, contend the best way to level the playing field is to have voluntary caps that would limit spending for all candidates.

The committee's first hearing of the year on campaign financing considered Democratic proposals; Republican bills also were considered next Wednesday and Thursday.

Discounters frequently fare better than other retailers in tough economic times as consumers opt for lower priced goods.

Leading the apparel category, Gap Inc., which has registered strong sales gains in recent months while many other retailers have floundered, advanced a mere 1 percent. Limited Inc., the nation's largest specialty apparel retailer, said same-store sales declined 3 percent.

Economists estimate consumer spending because it accounts for two-thirds of the nation's economic activity and is a primary factor in the recession. Many economists expect the downturn to continue well into the spring.

Judge threatening to block settlement

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal judge threatened Thursday to block any settlement of government civil claims over the Exxon Valdez oil spill until he decides whether the federal tribes must be allowed to join the talks.

U.S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin said he would issue a temporary restraining order to agree to delay a settlement until at least Monday, when he has scheduled a hearing a lawsuit filed by the tribes.

Justice Department attorney Lucy Grisham declined to comment. The tribes contend the government may be negotiating away some of their rights.

The lawsuit seeks to preserve the tribes' right to "subsidize off the natural resources of their ancestral lands" and to preserve the subsistence claims of the Native Alaskan villages arising from the discharge of oil from the Exxon

Valdez on March 24, 1989.

The tribes' attorney, Michael D. Hausfeld, told reporters the state and federal governments are settling our rights without hearing from us.

"These are significant issues which need to be resolved," Hausfeld said. "You're not going to be resolved with some facile statement by the state government that they're going to take care of our interest."

The government and Exxon apparently are close to an agreement to settle civil lawsuits over the massive oil spill in Prince William Sound, Alaska's attorney general, Charles Cole, said this week that only one major point remained to be settled.

Alaska Gov. Walter J. Hickel said from Juneau "It appears the court will allow them to negotiate, but at this point will not allow them to sign any kind of settlement."

Bush chooses banking head

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush has selected Lewis T. Preston, the former chairman of J.P. Morgan & Co., to succeed Barber Conable as president of the World Bank, the White House announced Thursday.

Conable, a close friend of President Bush since they served together in the House of Representatives in the 1970s, announced unexpectedly on Wednesday that he would retire on Sept. 1.

Conable, 68, indicated he wanted to spend more time with his family in upstate New York.

Preston, 64, retired as chairman of the board of J.P. Morgan in 1989.

House tries for compromise over shifting medical payments

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House is trying to compromise with Gov. Cecil Andrus over the bill to be voted last week shifting responsibility for medically indigent programs from counties to the state. But a bill introduced Thursday by the Ways and Means Committee still may run into objections from the governor. Andrus said in his veto message last Friday the original bill was too expensive and did not contain a program he deems critical. Ways and Means introduced a new version pushing the effective date back three months, trimming the cost for the first year of the new program. It also contains the medically needy program Andrus said he wanted. The latest proposal also requires counties



to pay the first \$10,000 in major medical cases. The vetoed version dropped the deductible to \$3,000. Sponsoring Rep. Tom Loertscher, R-Idaho Falls, said the medically needy program was included to meet Andrus' objection. But it delays the new program until October 1992, which might not be acceptable to the governor. The House has delayed a vote on possible override of the veto, while GOP leaders

negotiated with the Democrats and Andrus. Loertscher said he has not taken part in the usual negotiations, but presumes the new bill will be attractive to Democrats. At the same time, Ways and Means also introduced Andrus' version of the legislation. A Senate committee refused to introduce it earlier, which has been a sticking point in the negotiations. Andrus said in his veto message the House version would cost \$11.5 million and his proposal '\$5.8' million, although some Republicans dispute the figures. Both versions delay the starting date until October to reduce the cost in the 1992 state budget. The medically needy program pushed by Andrus also qualifies for federal funds. Loertscher said that would bring in \$3.4 mil-

lion in nine months of the next budget, and then \$16.3 million per year thereafter. Overall, the new proposal would cost \$6.1 million in general tax revenue in the 1992 budget and \$12.9 million per year thereafter. Loertscher said the main goal of his new bill is to extend medical coverage to needy people and get funding for medical welfare programs away from being financed by local property taxes. A former Bonneville County commissioner, he said he had experience with the problem while holding that office. "It's been sticking in my craw for years," he said. "The indigent fund has been totally funded by property tax. It is a social pro-

gram and it should be financed by a broader tax." The net effect of the changes would be to shift funding for indigent programs from county property taxes to general state revenue, made up of sales, income and other taxes. "It is a decent compromise," Loertscher said. "It's win-win for everybody." Another barrier to the compromise might be who controls the catastrophic care fund, now run by county officials. "If the state's going to pay the bill, the state has to have a say in not only the quality of services throughout the state, but also how those bills are going to be paid," the governor said.

Otter's vote kills phone scheme

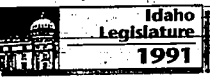
BOISE (AP) — For the second time in as many days, GOP Lt. Gov. Butch Otter has cast the tie-breaking vote to kill legislation in the Senate. Otter broke a 20-20 tie on Thursday to defeat creation of a state regulatory scheme for telephone solicitors. "This bill is anti-business," declared Republican Stan Hawkins of Ucon as six Democrats joined him and 12 other Republicans to force the tie. That led to the negative vote by Otter, who has a long record of opposing government interference in business. A day earlier, Otter broke a more partisan tie to kill legislation that would have required government agencies to buy recycled paper as long as they do not have to pay more than 10 percent above the price of new paper. Sen. Patricia McDermott of Pocatello, the only Democrat who joined Republicans in opposing that bill, kept the measure alive by indicating she might ask for reconsideration of the vote on Thursday.

But she declined to do that, formally killing the proposal just before midday. Sen. Russell Newcomb of Twin Falls was the only Republican to support the bill. Under the telemarketing measure, anyone who makes more than 30 new business telephone solicitations a month and is not registered with the state for some other purpose must register with the attorney general. Besides barring misrepresentation, fraudulent and other deceptive practices, the bill would have made it illegal for solicitors to harass customers, to refuse to hang up after being asked to do so, to charge a customer for the phone call without advising him first of the cost or to claim endorsement by any government agency. Any sale from a telephone solicitation would have to be followed up by a written confirmation, and customers would have to be given the option of cancelling before the sale would become final. With consumers nationwide losing an estimated \$10 billion to telemarketing

fraud last year, \$40 million of that in Idaho alone — supporters of the regulatory scheme said similar laws were on the books and working successfully in other states. "This line of statutes is becoming so prevalent, that states that don't enact this kind of law will get a greater share of this type of activity," Sen. Michael Burkett, D-Boise, said. "This is going after the boiler-room operations that go after Idaho consumers." Burkett and others cited endorsements from businessmen, law enforcement and consumer groups. But opponents contended that too many telemarketing frauds are operated from outside Idaho and the state just does not have the resources to enforce the regulations against them. In addition, they contended that the solicitors who are the real peddle-magazine-salesmen, investment brokers and insurance agents — are specifically exempt from the law. Sen. Jerry Thorne, R-Nampa, claimed the bill would only have imposed an additional burden on honest businessmen.

Higher education wins lion's share of public works budget

BOISE (AP) — Higher education has walked off with the lion's share of the money legislative budget writers earmarked for public works construction in their 1992 state spending blueprint. With little debate and less opposition on Thursday, the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee earmarked \$9 million for college and university projects in Idaho — Falls, Boise, Canyon County and Lewiston. The total construction budget for the year that begins July 1 was only \$15.8 million, and \$6.1 million of that was earmarked for the first phase of the new women's prison in Pocatello and renovation of the dining hall at the main prison south of Boise. Budget writers also authorized the Transportation, Fish and Game, Parks and Recreation and Administration departments to spend another \$4.3 million of their own money on a variety of public works projects. The committee's capital improvements decisions, the last major spending votes in drafting the new state budget, completely drained the public works account and required \$275,000 in general tax revenues to be skimmed off to "balance" the construction spending books. That left lawmakers with just \$6.3 million in uncommitted general tax revenue to cover any tax cut legislation or new spending



proposals that might clear the Legislature before adjournment late this month, including a potential compromise on indigent health care costs. That compromise between Republican legislative leaders and Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus, if it is negotiated, is expected to cost between \$7 million and \$9 million. In addition, the 1992 construction projects authorized by the budget panel included the commitment to spend \$9.8 million to complete them in the 1993 budget, but analysts estimated that there will only be about \$6.2 million available for the building program during that year. The legislative construction program differs significantly from the plan outlined by Andrus in his budget proposal. The committee endorsed \$2 million for renovation of the mathematics and geology buildings at Boise State University, \$2.3 million for a classroom building to expand BSU's vocational education operation in Canyon County into its Canyon County campus, \$3.2 million for initial construction of a higher education center in Idaho Falls

and \$15.5 million for renovation of the old library building at Lewis Clark State College. Andrus did not recommend any of those projects, and the one that he did back — \$2.4 million for completion of the new library at the University of Idaho — was ignored by the committee. Several committee members said they had been advised that the university could complete the project with the \$9.7 million it received just last week and the \$2 million they understood was being raised from other sources. The panel had earlier earmarked \$2 million of the general higher education appropriation for renovation of the university's chemistry building. The committee also approved \$120,000 to add 40 beds to the North Idaho Correctional Institution in Cottonwood, \$550,000 for relocation of the Parks and Recreation office in Coeur d'Alene and the initial phase of work on a new department headquarters in Boise and \$75,000 to complete the Lands Department office in Kamiah. Other administration recommendations ignored by the panel were \$660,000 for initial work on a new building at State Hospital North in Orofino, \$400,000 for a Lands Department office in McCall and \$66,000 for a new state communications tower.

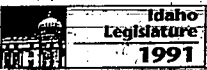
Senate backs protection for Payette

BOISE (AP) — Legislation protecting major segments of western Idaho's Payette River from disturbance through hydro-power or other development has been overwhelmingly approved by the state Senate.

We have all experienced the havoc of unplanned growth and development. Republican Herb Carlson of Eagle said, telling his colleagues the legislation will avoid repeating the mistakes of the past.

The bill cleared the Senate on a 30-11 vote Thursday and was forwarded to the House, where prospects for its approval were less bright.

Senate action came a day after the chamber's Resources and Environment Committee rejected protection under a different state law for the Middle Fork of the Salmon River and 27 of its tributaries. The committee was scheduled to consider



scald-down alternatives to that proposal next week.

That 1989 law targets maintenance of stream water quality while the 1988 law covering the Payette River plan is generally aimed at restricting hydro-power development although it also can limit logging and mining activities.

Resource industries, particularly mining, objected to the Middle Fork of the Salmon River proposal because its restrictions would have covered such an extensive area.

The Payette River plan offers protection from in-stream disturbance to the Main, North and South forks of the river. The Water Resources Board still retains authority to au-

thorize development if the board determines it will not detract from the environmental and other values of the river.

Earlier this year, the Legislature approved and Gov. Cecil Andrus signed into law similar protection for the South Fork of the Boise River and the Big Lost River creeks. That bill was opposed by logging interests, who claimed it would lock up key timber areas from harvest because of restrictions on crossing streams.

But a court settlement of challenges to the Forest Service's long-range management plan bars any timbering in the area until the next century.

And the protective designations are reviewed for possible modification every five years.

Critics of the Payette River plan claimed it was just another example

of the campaign to lock up Idaho's resources.

"Only a selfish generation would lock up a river like the Payette for itself and deny its offspring the wood, power and minerals for the future," Sen. George Vance, R-Parma, claimed.

Other opponents contended the debate pitted water users against conservationists and conservationists contended whether the river remains open to multiple use or is restricted.

But Andrus and other supporters emphasized that while the bill will stall two proposed power development projects that have already been rejected by the Water-Resource Board, it will not affect existing uses or rights on and along the river.

Board members have also pointed out that they have three different times in the past allowed developments on protected streams.

Saturday they were married in the hospital's Hope Chapel. Larsen's bed was wheeled into the chapel, and he took the vows while flat on his back. Third Circuit Judge Michael L. Hutschings performed the ceremony.

Intermountain Burn Center Associate Director Stephen E. Morris, who grafted Larsen's skin, played the wedding march.

House panel kills bill asking for restrictions

BOISE (AP) — Northern Idaho and its tourism industry proved a match for Idaho's farm caucus as a House committee killed the latest effort to curtail air pollution caused by grass-field burning.

After three hours of testimony from angry farmers on Monday and about a half-hour from Panhandle lawmakers and a tourism promoter on Wednesday, the Agricultural Affairs Committee voted unanimously to kill grass-noise legislation.

The committee's 16 members are farmers or ranchers. The lone northern Idaho member of the committee, Rep. June Judd, D-St. Maries, did not vote against the motion to kill the bill.

Rep. Wally Wright, D-Bayview, who sponsored the bill, said he would try once more, this time in the Senate.

Wright said he had struggled to balance the interests of grass seed farmers, who burn their fields to kill pests and diseases, and those who are irritated by late-summer grass-field smoke.

But the grass growers association dropped its support for Wright's bill when its representatives stood up to speak at Monday's hearing.

"Since they didn't uphold their end of the bargain, I am released," Wright said. "They came down here and they saw a chance to kill this bill and they jumped on it and they were successful."

Wright said he would not please farmers as he works on re-writing the measure.

Don Jacklin, co-owner of Jacklin Seed Co. in Post Falls, blamed the defeat of the bill on negative articles and editorials in northern Idaho newspapers.

Jacklin was in Boise Wednesday to watch the committee action. He submitted written testimony, but did not speak at the hearing.

Jacklin said his legislation was necessary to keep the peace in the

All four were appointed to new terms running until Jan. 1, 1994.

Medical center idles 37 workers

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center has laid off 37 employees as part of a plan to reduce the hospital's overall payroll.

Paul Tucker, the hospital's marketing director, said that while some departments were affected by the cuts, but said no departments or hospital services were eliminated entirely.

Employees said the hospital's Behavioral Health Center and orthopedic surgery wing were hard hit. Twelve licensed practical nurses reportedly lost their jobs.

The layoffs came in response to a revenue shortfall caused by reduced income from insurance companies, Medicare and other third-party payors, as well as fewer in-patients paying for a statement from the hospital.

"Idaho Falls is experiencing trends comparable to what has occurred in other parts of the country," Connery Hudson, vice president of HealthTrust, Inc., a western-region, said Wednesday from Nashville, Tenn.

Owyhee County officials want jail bond
MURPHY — Owyhee County officials want to build a new county jail in Murphy, and will ask taxpayers as early as May to approve a \$1.68 million bond issue to finance it.

If approved, the bond issue would cost property taxpayers an additional 56 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation annually. No date has been set for the election.

Owyhee County Sheriff Jim Nettleton said Wednesday that plans call for a 12,000-square-foot jail with office space, support area and a 30-bed jail on the south corner of the existing courthouse in Murphy.

Lewis-Clark College seeks fee increase
LEWISTON — Lewis-Clark State College has proposed a 7.1 percent fee hike for full-time non-resident students, college officials announced.

Lewis-Clark President Lee Vickers said on Wednesday that in-state critics last year that full-time students from Idaho were paying more of the hikes than part-time and non-resident students.

Out-of-state fees have not been raised since 1984, and part-time fees were last raised in 1989.

Boise murderer sentenced to death
BOISE — Zane Jack Fields has been sentenced to death for the Feb. 11, 1988, murder of Boise gift shop owner Mary Catherine Vanderford.

Fourth District Judge Gerald Schroeder said Fields, 32, of Boise, showed "a clear disregard for human life" in slaying the 69-year-old Vanderford to death while robbing her Wishing Well Gift Shop. He made off with \$50.

Schroeder, handing down his first death sentence in 15 years on the bench, said Thursday that he was convinced beyond a reasonable doubt that Fields meant to kill Vanderford.

Council gets praise for conservation
IDAHO FALLS — Environmentalists praised the Northwest Power Planning Council for its emphasis on energy conservation to meet the rising need for electricity in the next two decades.

But several speakers at a hearing on the council's 1991 power plan Wednesday in Idaho Falls said it needs to be even more aggressive in searching out new energy conservation strategies.

The council's plan calls for the Northwest to purchase more than 1,250 megawatts of conservation over the next 10 years. It also identifies another 1,400 megawatts of conservation that may become available.

Gen court upholds Fain death sentence
BOISE — The Idaho Supreme Court says although there was a procedural error committed when Charles Irvin Fain was sentenced to death, it was harmless and his new sentence is valid.

In a decision released Thursday, the court voted 4-1 to uphold the death penalty ordered by District Judge Jim Doolittle for Fain, 42, for killing a 2-year-old Darilyn Johnson.

In a decision written by Justice Charles McDevitt, the Supreme Court said although a victim impact was improperly admitted, it did not influence the trial judge in his decision to impose the death sentence and therefore was harmless error.

Former chief sentenced for sex abuse
CALDWELL — The former New Plymouth police chief has been sentenced to at least six months in jail for sexually abusing a 13-year-old girl for four years. Dennis Palmer, 41, pleaded guilty in November to three counts of lewd and lascivious conduct with a minor. He admitted to having sexual intercourse with other acts with the child between January 1986 and September 1990, when he was as Payette County Deputy sheriff and then New Plymouth Police Chief.

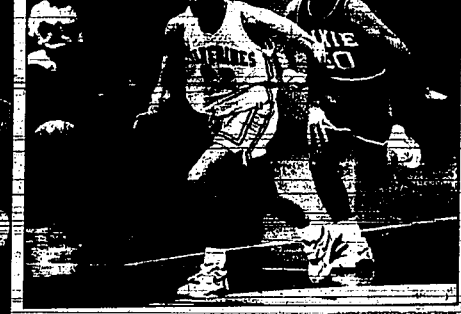

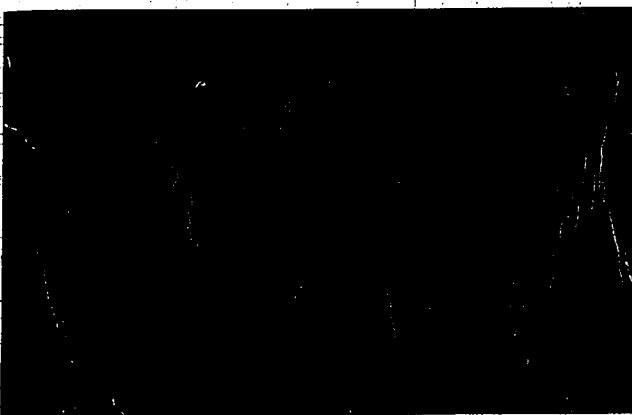

Senate overwhelmingly confirms Madigan as new USDA secretary

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate, on a vote of 99-0, confirmed Edward Madigan as agriculture secretary on Thursday.

The action came after senators heaped nothing but praise upon a longtime House colleague who cited the woes of America's dairy and wheat farmers as among the pressing challenges of his new job.

Madigan, 55, an Illinois Republican watched the vote on television in the office of Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole of Kansas. Senators presented him with a copy of the "unanimous roll call, which missed only the name of absent Republican Strom Thurmond of South Carolina.

Eighteen years in Congress, including his current role as senior Republican on the House Agriculture Committee, and a gracious, compromising manner made Madigan's road to confirmation silky smooth.

He is a class, quality person, said Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill., who said Madigan has done more than almost any other member of

Congress to bring about American farm policy responsive to changing world markets, said Sen. Richard Lugar, R-Ind.

With his experience and outstanding leadership qualities he will be a very positive and consistent force, said Sen. Thad Cochran, R-Miss.

Madigan will replace Clayton Yeutter, who is taking charge of the Republican National Committee.

Madigan appeared before the Senate Agriculture Committee this week and pledged to be "meaner than a junkyard dog" in helping U.S. farmers during international trade negotiations.

He said the financial woes of dairy and wheat farmers would be among the top issues he faces at the Agriculture Department.

Madigan will also have his hands full implementing the 1990 farm law, which sets agriculture policy for five years. He was one of the measure's architects.

Committee chairman Patrick Leahy, D-Vt., said Madigan is qualified for the job, but "obviously there will be areas where we may disagree."

Leahy wants to help dairy farmers through special legislation, but Madigan opposes that move, saying it would open the farm law to other revisions.

Sen. Paul Wellstone, D-Minn., said family farmers are "struggling for their economic survival."

"The health and vitality of rural America is not based upon the number of acres that are farmed or the number of animals, but the number of family farmers that are able to support themselves," Wellstone said.

Madigan ran a family cat company and was a state legislator before voters in north-central Illinois first elected him to Congress in 1972.

Cracked hinges send Discovery back to hangar

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — Space shuttle Discovery, discovered by large cracks in two door hinges, was moved from the launch pad back to the hangar Thursday as NASA worked on getting Atlantis launched in early April.

There are no time cracks on Atlantis' hinges, but NASA managers and the shuttle's crew, decided Wednesday to proceed as planned with the launch because the cracks are so small. An astronomical observatory will be carried aloft by Atlantis, and two of the ship's five as-

tronauts plan the first spacewalk in more than five years. Discovery was back in the massive assembly building Thursday, following a 3 1/2-mile trip that took more than five hours.

It was the third time in less than a year that NASA has had to shuttle off the pad for repairs. The agency's two other spaceships were moved back last summer because of leaky fuel lines.

Discovery was supposed to lift off on the year's first shuttle flight Saturday. Top NASA officials last

week decided to delay the military mission because of the size of the cracks — each is 2 inches long — and uncertainty over their cause.

NASA plans to replace all four of the spaceship's hinges with parts from the newly finished shuttle Endeavour.

Cracks also have been found on the lugs of three of Columbia's four hinges, but they are less than a half-inch long.

Atlantis' three cracks, each on a different hinge, are a quarter-inch long.

Drug policy job goes to Martinez

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Judiciary Committee approved J. Lee on Thursday the nomination of former Gov. Bob Martinez as President Bush's drug policy adviser.

Judiciary Chairman Joseph R. Biden Jr., D-Del., expressed misgivings about Martinez' "minimum qualifications" for the job.

But Biden extended his support as long as he is willing to fight for more than one avenue, "in the drug battle, meaning treatment and education programs as well as enforcement. The panel's vote sent the nomination to the full Senate, which is expected to act upon it within two

weeks. Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, lauded Martinez' drug-fighting record as governor of Florida. And "I'm convinced he demonstrated a lot of commitment," in his earlier testimony before the committee, Hatch said.

Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., disagreed, saying "Under the Martinez administration, Florida ranked first in the nation in incarceration, but 21st in the nation in substance abuse treatment funding and 32nd in prevention funding. Prison calls doubled during the Martinez years, but treatment and education lagged behind." Kennedy and two other

Democrats, Paul Simon of Illinois and Howard Matzenbaum of Ohio, voted against the nomination.

Hatch parried Kennedy's statistical argument with his own, noting that Florida was among the top 10 states in per capita spending on drug treatment.

Kennedy said Florida's mandatory prison sentences for drug offenders "flooded the criminal justice system with nonviolent offenders who should have been treated in the first place." Due to the resulting prison overcrowding, "the state was forced to release thousands of violent offenders before their sentences had expired," he said.

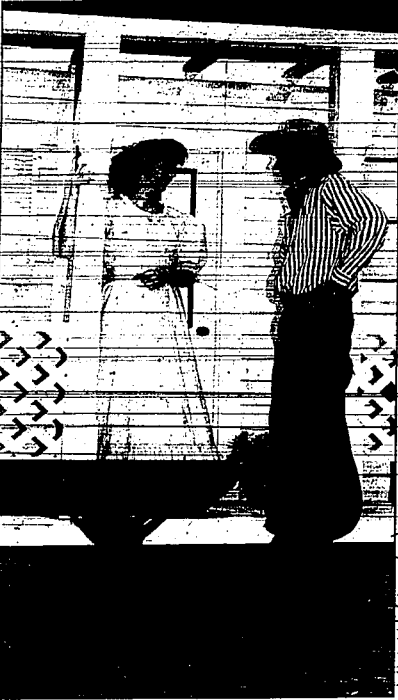

Stone offers riveting biography when 'Doors' avoids MTV land

Oliver Stone's "The Doors" is a somewhat sympathetic, tell-it-as-it-was story of the life and death of Jim Morrison, leader of the title rock group, who died in 1971 at the age of 27, in Paris, in a bathtub.

Review

The authorities say that it was heart failure, but Morrison had always courted death. He had been on drugs and booze all his adult years. The movie is a grand mix, monotonous for the first 70 minutes, then riveting for the next 70. The first 70 play like that much MTV, and 10 minutes of that are enough for anyone.

The film also spends too much time on the "Doors" concert appearances during the latter portion of the film, but that second half, despite this indulgence, is strong enough to leave us feeling a bit sorry for a man who programmed his own death.

Morrison, according to the film, was a wanderer who kept to himself. It took a reporter to learn that he had a brother and sister and that their father was an admiral.

When the film begins, Morrison is 5 years old, who witnesses a highway accident in which some of the passengers, American Indians, die. Morrison is apparently haunted by this sight because Stone, who directed and co-authored the script, keeps returning to the site of the accident by driving on the side of the road. In Morrison's hallucinations, the Indian is not always dying. Most often, he is alive and moving about, which adds a mystical note to the film.

At close range, we witness Morrison return to haunt the man he became. It is a rather poetic touch, but it works.

The things that don't work are most of those first 70 minutes. Stone, however, does manage to re-secure the world of drugs with amazing in-

other women, including a reporter. She is apparently wild about this man and is willing to suffer any indignity. She, of course, is also on drugs much of the time.

Kathleen Quinlan plays the reporter who comes on to Morrison and pursues him, thinking she can somehow make him commit to her. She, too, however, is on drugs. Drugs were what make the world go round for these people. Sometimes they died from them, but that was the way it was during the early drug years.

Dennis Hopper, Ed Sullivan and Andy Warhol are some of the other people who are impersonated in the film. The actor who plays Sullivan seems to be doing him in a mask, one that has frozen his features. It is an unnecessary touch. It would have been enough to hire someone who merely suggests the man.

The film was shot in subdued color, a wise choice on Stone's part, and the background music, apart from the music of the Doors, sounds, at times, like background music for a horror film. Well, that's what this is. It isn't slice and dice, but it isn't sex-comedy, either.

When it is good, the R-rated "The Doors" is rock-star biography at its best. When it isn't, it is one more trip through MTV land.

More Morrison-mania on the horizon

There has always been a certain amount of cult to the show-biz king that "death makes a great career move." Particularly in rock and roll, where the tradition of adoring dead singers dates back to 1954 and Johnny Ace from Buddy Holly to Otis Redding to Stevie Ray Vaughan, it's hard to think of a star whose recordings didn't suddenly sell better after ascending to heaven.

But has there ever been a case of death worship quite like the cult of Jim Morrison? In 1971, when Morrison died at 27 of heart failure, the Doors were pretty much finished as pop idols. It had been two years since the group had last cracked the Top 10, and even that had been a fluke success. An arranged trifle titled "Touch Me" — was derided as a pathetic betrayal.

"Riders on the Storm," the last Doors single with Morrison, sold passably after the singer's death, peaking at No. 14. "L.A. Woman" (made it to No. 9). Although the surviving members reissued two albums of Morrisonless material, it seemed like this was the end for the Doors.

And then a funny thing happened. Slowly, unexpectedly, almost inexplicably, the Doors returned hip again. Maybe it had to do with album-rock radio which, as the '70s wore on, began to rely more and more on oldies; maybe it was Francis Ford Coppola's "Apocalypse Now," which used "The End" as frame for its tale of death and dissipation in Vietnam. It might even have had to do with keyboardist Ray Manzarek's emergence as a punk rock godfather in L.A., where he was behind the first two X albums.

Whatever the reason, it worked. Whereas 1973's "The Best of the Doors" barely even denied the charts, "The Doors Greatest Hits," released seven years later, sold more than two million. A Morrison biography, "Nobody Gets Out of Here Alive" by Danny Sugarmann and Jerry Hopkins, screamed into best-sellerdom. Poster and t-shirt sales soared.

As a 1981 Rolling Stone cover put it: "He's hot, he's sexy and he's dead."

And now, yet another round of Morrison-mania is on the horizon. Oliver Stone's big-budget film bio, "The Doors," may be the most obvious sign, but there are others. Doors songs are getting covered with astonishing regularity. (Bibi Stening did "L.A. Woman," the Cure copied "Hello, I Love You"), while the band's sound is an obvious influence on groups like Inspiral Carpets.

But why? Certainly isn't the music. Although the Doors' output had its moments, the band's legacy is slight. For one thing, the Doors were quickly dwarfed by imitators such as Iggy Pop, who easily outdid Morrison's onstage excesses, and Alice Cooper, who turned the Doors' confrontational dramatics into genuine rock theater.

When Morrison blazed, he blazed. He was in Paris after having been convicted of gross behavior during a performance in the United States. His case was being appealed when he went to Europe, followed by his girlfriend, who died three years after he did.

"The Doors" tells much the same story. "Sid and Nancy" did, but it cannot be dismissed as just another drug opera. The latter portion of the film is too good, and Val Kilmer, as Morrison, is absolutely superb. According to Stone, Kilmer sang all the songs "with only a few exceptions."

"If you liked 'The Doors,' you may find added reason to appreciate the film, though Stone doesn't overdo it with the songs. Where he does overdo is the concert footage, scene after scene in which a young man and woman rip naked and run to the stage.

Heg Ryan plays the flower child who loves Morrison, even after she sees him in action with a number of

chanalia, catharsis. Morrison pictured himself a poet and a lost soul, flirting with death and willing to be crucified on the excesses of art. He didn't want to be Buddy Holly or Muddy Waters, the way other rockers did. For Morrison, the only fitting models were Blake and Rimbaud, Huxley and Kerouac, writers whose works reached for the heavens even as their lives dragged them to hell.

It's a wonderfully romantic notion of art, and one which appeals strongly to the knowledge-hungry, experience-obsessed adolescent mind. Most of Morrison's poetry was bawdy at the extreme, filled with easy rhymes and obvious images, and though it grappled with many of life's primal dilemmas, his work did so in a most sophisticated, unobtrusive way. Sure, "The End" addressed the Oedipus complex, trouble is, it ends up sounding like a slow-witted summary from Psych 101.

Even so, Morrison understood how to act the part: He knew the myths of Dionysus and the theories of Arundel ("Alabama Song") and the Oedipus legend ("The End"). Rock, as such, seemed too simple for these guys; they wanted something artier, more resonant. They wanted poetry, bac-

"STRANGE DAYS" (1967): A marked fall-off from the first album, this tries to substitute mood for content, and fails. "People Are Strange" was the hit.

"WAITING FOR THE SUN" (1968): Psychedelic silliness, enlivened only by the roller-rink organ of "Hello, I Love You."

Declining issues outnumber advances as market pulls back slightly

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks dropped 9.90 to 2,963.37. Declining issues outnumbered advances by about 10 to 9 in an active trading session. New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, which had 752 up, 833 down and 466 unchanged.

Volume on the floor of the Big Board came to 197.06 million shares, down from 252.29 million in the previous session. Total volume in regional exchanges and in the over-the-counter market, totaled 242.03 million shares.

The Dow briefly crossed 3,000 Wednesday, but failed to surpass the closing high of 2,999.75 it reached last summer. Analysts said investors were looking ahead to Friday's scheduled report from the Department of Labor on the employment situation in February. Advance estimates call for an increase in the unemployment rate to 6.3 percent in January, and a decline of roughly 100,000 in nonfarm payroll. The impact of February data is expected to be mitigated in the markets, however, by the presumption that they were influenced by the since-concluded Gulf war.

Winters, psychiatric counseling aside, plays eccentric characters to the max

Pam Dawber once said that working with improvisational geniuses Jonathan Winters and Robin Williams in "Mork & Mindy" was like going to work in an insane asylum.

That analogy may seem like more than a mere figure of speech to Winters, who underwent psychiatric counseling in 1961 during six months of institutionalized therapy.

He's reluctant to talk about it today, but "not because I'm ashamed that I cracked up," the master comic, who plays eccentric, retired Marine Corps sergeant Glibby Davis in the ABC sitcom "Davis Rules," (airing Tuesdays) says, he simply doesn't want to sound like a whining celebrity.

"I think of the guy in Kansas making \$26,000 a year and trying to keep the farm," Winters explains.

"He looks at people like me making six, maybe seven figures a year and says, 'This guy is telling me his problems? I'm not trying to avoid the question. I did my time. I'll say this though: People have trouble with booze or pills or drugs or whatever. What scared me is that I cracked up on my own. But I had the opportunity to do something about it and did.' And that, as befaling the Jonathan Winters the world knows he deals with the subject the way he knows best, by switching to humor." When I was released the doctor said, 'Jonathan, what is psychiatry to you?'

I said, 'Very expensive.'

He said, 'But you can't put a

price on your mind.'

"I said, 'No, but you sure tried to.'

It's not unusual for people to use comedy as a defense mechanism, and perhaps that's the case with Winters. Behind the mask is a man who may have smoothed out life's bumps with laughter. In conversation he often harkens back to the alcoholic father and broken home of his childhood. He was only 4 when his parents split up over his father's drinking, but he remembers the situation clearly. "I think Times you can remember back to when you are 1," Winters says. "I remember the expressions on his face. You could see that this was a guy in trouble, that he was crying, unhappy, really bent out of shape."

Winters' past seems to have a particular relevance to "Davis Rules," a multigenerational family sitcom in

which he plays the father of a school principal (Randy Quaid) who is a widower and the father of three boys. In one episode, the oldest boy is failing a class but finds support from his dad and wacky grandpa.

"I think most people are afraid of falling," says Winters. "I had an old man with the longest finger of any Caucasian man I've ever known, and he'd point it at me and say, 'You're dumb.' That really helps a kid, you know. A kid needs support, someone to say, 'You're going to be OK, man. So you got some D's here and some C's. Hey, you got one A. Wow. Let's go down and get a pizza.'"

Q: We haven't heard much about Lyle Alzado, that hulking football player we see in those TV commercials. What's become of him? — A.R.

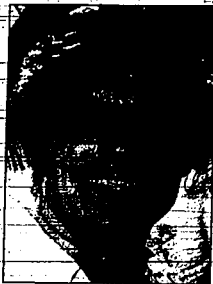

Made-for-TV movies, favorite series put CBS in Nielsen's number 1 spot

LOS ANGELES (AP) — CBS was back on top in the weekly ratings race, this time aided by ambitious made-for-television movies and strong showings from favorite series.


Part two of CBS' "And the Sea Will Tell," starring Rachel Ward in a courtroom drama about a double murder that takes place on an exotic island, ranked fourth in the A.C. Nielsen Co. ratings released Tuesday.

CBS' "Lies Before Kisses," a psychological drama starring Jaclyn Smith as a woman whose life falls apart after she learns her husband had an affair with a high-priced hooker, earned the network a two-way tie for seventh place with NBC's "The Cosby Show."

In overall ratings, CBS received a 13.3 average. ABC and NBC tied for second place with a 12.1 average rating.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

Last week marked the third consecutive win for CBS, which busted out of its usual last-place status with a heavy load of special programming. Propelled by February's Grammy Awards broadcast and retrospectives of such legendary CBS

Young rider in family business

Q: What can you tell me about the actor who plays Jimmy "Wild Bill" Hickok on "The Young Riders"?

A: Josh Brolin, the son of actor James Brolin, broke into show business at age 16 in 1985 when he was cast in the Steven Spielberg film "Goonies."

Television guest appearances followed on "Highway to Heaven," the pilot of "21 Jump Street" and the TV movie "Prison for Children."

In 1987, he co-starred in the short-lived NBC series, "Private Eye."

Brolin was born in Los Angeles and reared in Paso Robles, Calif. He is married to actress Alice Adair and lives in New York.

Q: What happened to "The Marsha Warfield Show"?

A: The comedian's talk show was dropped by NBC after an extended tryout period.

In an era when a normal trout lasts one or two weeks, Warfield's 10-month venture (beginning in March 1990) was an exceptionally long test.

The ratings were good in the early months but later they faltered and the show became a casualty when NBC revamped a portion of its daytime lineup.

Q: Who wrote the music for the miniseries "Lonesome Dove" and is it available on a sound-track album?

A: "Lonesome Dove" was one of two major television miniseries scores written by Basil Poledouris (the other was "America").

However, movie fans are likely to be most familiar with his work. Poledouris wrote the music for the films "RoboCop," "Red Dawn," "Conan the Barbarian," "White

Fang," "Flight of the Intruder," "Quigley Down Under" and "The Hunt for Red October."

Poledouris, who grew up in Garden Grove, won an Emmy in 1989 for his work on "Lonesome Dove."

According to CBS, the music for the miniseries is not available on tape, CD or record.

Q: Why are there so many reruns in January? Why do the networks run out of episodes so soon?

A: This is a question often asked by viewers.

The days of the September-to-May television season are long gone. Economic factors the last few years have cut the number of first-run series episodes from 39 to 22.

A popular show might get 26. New episodes are usually shown in September, October, March and April, and the sweeps months of November, February and May.

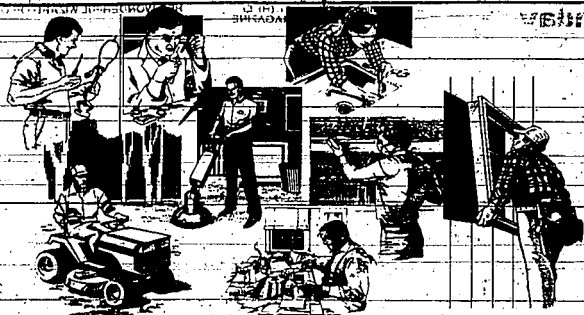

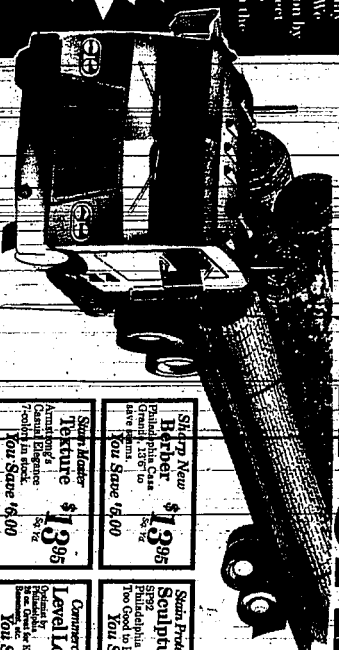
