# Mountain Home pilots recall initial strike of air assault against Baghdad

**MOUNTAIN HOME** — Air Force pilot Lt. Col. Dennis Hardziej flew 28 combat missions over Iraq during the Persian Gulf War, but he will never forget the first.

"We were one of the first groups across the border. The Iraqis didn't know we were coming," Hardziej said. "We went in with no protection; it was about as dangerous as any fighter mission."

Hardziej was one of 24 EF-111 pilots to fly a dozen "Ravens" back to Mountain Home Air Force Base Thursday afternoon.

That first unprotected mission into enemy territory in January was made even more dangerous by the fact that Hardziej's EF-111 jet was unarmed. The group of three electronic warfare jets flew into Iraqi airspace to jam Baghdad's radar and clear the way for the war's first air attacks.

The mission, flown between midnight and 2 a.m. was to "sneak in and turn off the jammers" to prevent detection of

allied fighter-bombers close behind, Hardziej said. "It was a very tough mission."

Through the darkness, the pilots could see Iraqi attack planes bent on shooting down the allied jets, he said.

"They had very good radar," Hardziej said. "We were up there avoiding them. Of course, with the planes they have, they can shoot you down before you even see them."

Fellow pilot Capt. Russ Hodgkins agreed that the first mission was the war's most frightening.

"After that first mission, there wasn't that fear of the unknown. We didn't get quite as nervous about it," Hodgkins said. Despite those first-flight jitters, both pilots said they were confident their mission would be successful.

"I called this a Holy War," said Hardziej, who also served in the 1989 invasion of Panama. "The gulf war was

like black and white. We were good over there fighting evil.... I think we proved that we are the best fighting force anywhere in the world."

Hodgkins said his 33-combat-missions went as smoothly as could be expected.

"We were as well-trained as you could possibly be," he said. "And we had the best equipment that was kept in the best condition possible."

Amid joyful jet-side reunions with their respective families, both pilots remembered the two fellow members of the 366th Tactical Fighter Wing who did not return.

Cpts. Paul Richard Eichenlaub II and Douglas Lloyd Bradt were killed when their EF-111s went down south of the Saudi-Iraqi border in February.

"I know it sounds trite, but you do have to put the loss out of your mind," said Hodgkins, who served with Eichenlaub in England for four years. "We had our time of grief, and then we had to get on with the job we were sent to do."

"We were all really hurt," Hardziej recalled. "There's no way to replace that."

# Don't worry about flap, Bush tells general

**WASHINGTON** — President Bush on Thursday took some of the sting out of his contradiction of Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf's comments about ending the Persian Gulf War, telling the four-star commander "not to worry about this incident."

Bush called Schwarzkopf and told him "this is much ado about nothing," according to deputy presidential press

secretary Roman Popadiuk. The spokesman said Bush assured the general that "They're on the same wavelength and that this is one of those little irritants that shouldn't, you know, become any big thing."

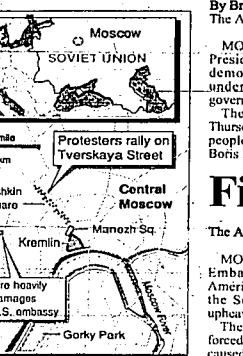
Schwarzkopf, the highly popular allied commander, drew contradictory retorts from Bush and other administration officials. He's telling a television interviewer he had recommended to the president that the allies continue their

pursuit of Iraqi forces on Feb. 27, the day Bush ordered a conditional cease-fire.

On Thursday, "The president told Gen. Schwarzkopf not to worry about this incident," Popadiuk said. "The President is totally relaxed about it, and ... is convinced they are ... on the same wavelength, and he stands 100 percent solidly behind him," the spokesman said.

He said Schwarzkopf "was very pleased and appreciative of the president's phone call."

# Defiant Muscovites eroding Gorbachev's control

**MOSCOW** — The mass defiance of Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev's ban on demonstrations in Moscow has further undermined the authority of the central government that he heads.

The clash of wills in the Soviet capital Thursday was on its surface a victory for the people power of Russian Federation leader Boris N. Yeltsin.

# School funding hike set

**BOISE** — After negotiating for nearly four hours, a House-Senate conference committee agreed Thursday evening to put an extra \$3 million in the \$484.5 million public school budget.

The new budget, \$2 million less than the Senate voted a day earlier, still must be approved by the House and Senate, and House GOP Caucus Chairman Con Mahoney said it would be "a hard sell."

Earlier in the day, the 56-member Republican majority voted 49-32 against



the Senate's bid to improve the public school budget by \$5 million.

That threw the matter into a conference committee. After 16 proposals failed to win a majority, both the House and Senate negotiators moved by Sen. John Hansen, R-Idaho Falls, finally prevailed.

Mahoney said he would call a GOP caucus first thing Friday morning, and said he would try to convince the Republicans to accept the latest offer. But he said it could be tough, because the Republicans stressed earlier in the day that they did not

# Last tax cut bills on way to Andrus

**BOISE** — The final two tax cuts pending in the 1991 Legislature cleared the Idaho Senate Thursday as the latest financial update showed general tax collections falling short of expectations.

With little opposition, the Senate approved a \$5.3 million expansion in the exemptions from the 5-percent sales tax, and a \$100,000 income tax credit to the company hired to determine the feasibility of establishing a nuclear medical research and brain cancer treatment facility at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

That research at the INEL is focused on the Boron Neutron Capture Therapy for treatment of a rare brain tumor, that has been the subject of basic research for several years. The next step is to refit an idle reactor at the facility so research can be accelerated.

The Senate votes completed action on seven tax cut proposals. The other five, totaling just over \$2.3 million were awaiting action by the governor, who has raised questions about the apparent trend of eroding the state's tax base at the same time demands for spending mount.

# First meeting on wilderness system at Arco on Saturday

ARCO (AP) — After months of planning and decades of debate, real negotiations on adding to Idaho's 4 million-acre wilderness system are scheduled to start Saturday in Arco.

Wilderness negotiators — including representatives of industry, environmental and recreation groups — will discuss roadless areas on the Challis and Sawtooth national forests during closed meetings Saturday.

It will be the first of six regional meetings aimed at deciding the fate of 9 million acres of roadless land within Idaho's 10 national forests. And the mediator who will oversee the talks said he expects them to be thorough.

"Given what I'm hearing about the issues, I don't think we're going to finish Saturday," said Ty Tice of The Mediation Institute in Seattle, which has a \$150,000 state contract to lead the wilderness negotiations.

Saturday's talks could come down to a struggle over the Boulder-White Clouds areas of central Idaho.

Environmentalists and off-road vehicle users figure to be at loggerheads over the White Clouds, located in the Sawtooth National Recreation Area.

"That's where we do most of our playing," said Clark Collins of Pocatello, executive director of the

Blue Ribbon Coalition, an off-road vehicle user group. "They want some of the areas that we want."

The White Clouds were included in the last major attempt to resolve Idaho's wilderness debate — the 1.4 million acre wilderness bill proposed in 1987 by Gov. Cecil Andrus and then-Sen. James McClure. The Andrus-McClure bill proposed about 100,000 acres of wilderness in the White Clouds.

Collins said he considers the Andrus-McClure bill a "starting point" for new wilderness talks, but that off-road vehicle users already are being pushed onto a fraction of the Sawtooth National Recreation Area. Out of nearly 750 miles of trails, barely 150 miles are available for motorized use.

"We're just trying to protect what we've got," he said.

Another area of dispute likely to come up Saturday is Borah Peak, which at 12,662 feet is Idaho's highest mountain.

While Andrus and McClure conceded that development is highly unlikely at Borah Peak, their bill proposed setting aside about 50,000 acres of Challis National Forest land around the mountain as wilderness.

Collins said his group could accept a wilderness designation for Borah Peak, but that some areas around the mountain are important access points for off-road vehicle users.

# Senate committee defeats waste measure

BOISE (AP) — A non-binding resolution endorsing traditional operations of the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory but opposing further radioactive waste storage there has been defeated in a Senate committee amid a flurry of partisan bickering.

Democrats said they wanted the state to go on record against turning eastern Idaho into a dumping ground. Republicans called it political gamesmanship.

And when the rhetoric ended in the leadership-dominated State Affairs Committee Thursday, the resolution died on a party-line 5-3 vote.

The 20-minute, often-caustic exchange only underscored the debate that has raged between Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus and state Republican leaders, including U.S. Sens. Steve Symms and Larry Craig, since February when Andrus barred the

Energy Department from shipping high-level nuclear waste from a mothballed Colorado utility reactor to INEL for temporary storage.

The governor's action is being challenged in the courts, and the GOP has maintained his combative handling of the matter has severely damaged state relations with the INEL, one of its biggest employers.

Republican President Pro Tem Michael Crapo of Idaho Falls said flatly that the resolution, sponsored by Democratic Caucus Chairman John Peavey of Carey, was politically motivated to reinforce the governor's position and pun the GOP as out-of-step with public opinion opposing further waste storage in eastern Idaho.

"It's always fun to jab people with political barbs," Crapo said. "There is politics being played here. But the bottom line is this is too important to play politics with."

Democrats disputed other GOP claims that their resolution was so restrictive that if Congress followed it the INEL would be shut down.

"You guys find yourselves riding the line," Democrat Michael Blackburn of Coeur d'Alene told the Republicans, "because you're trying to protect your senior senator" who finds his position at odds with the public opinion polls.

# Religious instruction bill passes

BOISE (AP) — A bill allowing high school students to be released from regular classes during school hours for a limited amount of religious instruction, or for other reasons, has won final legislative approval.

The measure was passed by the House 69-11 on Wednesday.

But even if it is signed into law by Gov. Cecil Andrus, students still would have to meet attendance requirements for high school graduation and get parental consent to be released from regular classes. They would be allowed a maximum of 165 hours per school year for outside instruction, and local school boards would decide when students could be released.

"This is local control at its best," said House Majority Leader Gary Montgomery, R-Boise. "It allows parents discretion and the school

board discretion."

Rep. Mel Richardson, R-Idaho Falls, said after the debate that many eastern Idaho schools already let students out of class for religious instruction. But Rep. Fred Tilman, R-Boise, said the recent controversy over prayers at graduation ceremonies and other issues involving separation of church and state has many school officials worried.

An amendment Tilman sponsored added "other" purposes to the provisions for religious instruction, a move he said would placate the American Civil Liberties Union.

The amendment does not spell out those purposes, but supporters

said it would allow students a chance to pursue course work outside high school or to get a job.

Currently, "They are being cut off from any sort of activity that would further that goal," said Rep. Ronald Black, R-Twin Falls.

But an opponent said the provisions would give students a way out of attending school.

"We have exceptions, exceptions and exceptions to the 90 percent (attendance) rule," said Rep. Monte Easuddin, D-Sandpoint. "This is another one of those exceptions."

Students are required to have a 90-percent attendance record to graduate from high school. But Tilman said there was no need to be concerned about students being away from school for religious or other instruction.

# Regional landfill plans on way to scrap heap

CALDWELL (AP) — Plans to make the Pickle's Butte Landfill near Nampa a four-county regional garbage dump have been trashed.

Commissioners from Canyon, Owyhee, Gem and Washington counties agreed informally Wednesday to dissolve the Southwest Regional Solid Waste District. A formal dissolution vote will be conducted in April after a \$10,000 engineering bill is paid by the district.

Operations at the Canyon County landfill did not change when the district was formed and the commission does not force any changes in service now.

Last September, after nearly two years of planning, the four counties formed the district in hopes of responding to new federal regulations for landfills and generating enough revenue to cover increasing costs.

The district planned to close landfills in the less-populated counties

and use the Pickle's Butte Landfill as a regional dump. Canyon County planned to buy the landfill site, which it currently leases from the Bureau of Land Management, and then sell it to the district for regional use.

But earlier this month, the Canyon County Commission got word from the BLM that it will not sell the landfill site. Commissioners also learned that the county may not be able to renew its lease, which expires in 2001.

Family and friends liked the name for the baby born March 13, but Mrs. Nelson said Shane had to be convinced.

# 437 Idahoans entitled to part of \$7.95 million

BOISE (AP) — An estimated 437 Idahoans are in line for a share of the \$7.95 million Mitsubishi Electronics America Inc. has agreed to refund to consumers nationwide.

The refunds are aimed at settling charges that the U.S. Department of Justice and the Federal Trade Commission of Mitsubishi and MGA brand televisions illegally fixed the retail price of some of its TV sets.

Echohawk said Mitsubishi has agreed to pay refunds of \$20 to \$54 each to consumers nationwide, including hundreds of Idaho residents who bought the products in 1988.

The price-fixing allegations were included in complaints filed this week by the attorneys general of all 50 states and the District of Columbia in U.S. District Court in Baltimore.

Even though Mitsubishi agreed to settle the charges and pay refunds, the company has denied that it engaged in illegal activity.

Echohawk said the televisions involved are models CS1345, CS1945, CS2045, CS2013, CS2014, CS2054, CS2653 and CS2654. Consumers who bought any of those Mitsubishi or MGA TVs in 1988 are entitled to refunds.

The attorney general said consumers who filled out warranty cards automatically qualify for rebates. Others who can be identified from sales records will get claim forms by mail.

**Tough decisions ahead: Fix bugged U.S. embassy or not**

WASHINGTON (AP) — A devastating fire at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow may finally force Washington to decide whether to fix or scuttle the building's "bug"-infested replacement.

The building project already has cost American taxpayers about \$300 million, producing an empty building purportedly riddled with electronic eavesdropping devices, housing for 124 embassy employees and a multi-sports complex.

It almost certainly will cost another \$300 million before anyone moves into the new offices. Congress and the administration have been unable to agree whether to tear down the unfinished building and start over or accept part of it as inherently insecure and build a two- to four-story "top hat" on the existing structure to house all classified functions.

In the meantime, diplomatic operations in Moscow have been crippled by Thursday's fire, which destroyed much of the old embassy building just as a \$50 million renovation was nearing completion.

The government had hoped to abandon the deteriorating old building, but was forced to renovate it while officials in Washington decided the fate of the new structure.

First indications were that welding being done as part of the renovation sparked the fire, sources in Washington reported.

The partially finished sprinkler and alarm system

installed as part of the project was credited with helping the embassy's 400 employees escape without serious injury, but it also caused considerable water damage.

The building, labeled "a fire trap" by one of its congressional watchdogs, was evacuated, and the key offices won't be serviceable probably for months, if ever. The fire was at least the fourth in recent years and the second to cause extensive damage.

A congressional source, speaking on condition of anonymity, said there was still no consensus on what to do about the new building that planners two decades ago considered necessary even then to replace the crumpled and crumbling old complex on Tchaikovsky Street.

Work on the new eight-story brick office tower was halted five years ago after U.S. inspectors discovered what they identified as highly sophisticated electronic eavesdropping devices implanted in structural parts of the building that had been assembled off the premises by Soviet workers.

Precise figures are hard to come by, but one source familiar with the work estimated that intelligence agencies, the State Department and various government authorities have spent \$60 million to \$70 million trying to figure out just what the Soviets did to the building.

**Reagan, marking decade since attack, endorses 7-day handgun purchase wait**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Former President Reagan declared his support for a seven-day waiting period for handgun purchases Thursday at a reunion with doctors and nurses credited with saving his life after he was shot a decade ago.

Although Reagan's administration opposed federal gun-control legislation, he said he had always favored the "Brady Bill" which bears the name of his press secretary who was permanently disabled in the assassination attempt.

"It's just plain common sense that there be a waiting period to allow local law enforcement officials to conduct background checks on those who wish to buy a handgun," Reagan said.

"I support the Brady Bill and I urge Congress to enact it without further delay," he said.

President Bush, who was Reagan's vice president, has steadfastly

**Death pushes tests for lead levels in kids**

ATLANTA (AP) — Health officials are calling for yearly blood tests for lead poisoning in young children after a Wisconsin boy died from exposure to lead-based paint, the first such death reported in more than a decade.

"This is a dramatic example of the worst-case scenario of what happens if paint is ignored as a source of lead exposure," Wisconsin epidemiologist Joe Shirmer said.

The death of the 28-month-old Waukesha boy was documented in a report issued Thursday by the federal Centers for Disease Control.

Shirmer said the case proves that children must be tested yearly for levels of lead in their blood because symptoms do not appear until lead poisoning has reached dangerous levels.

Although such deaths are now rare because lead-based paint is outlawed in new buildings and testing and treatment have improved — hundreds of thousands of children each year have their intellectual growth stunted because of exposure, the Atlanta-based CDC reported.

The last documented death from lead-based paint exposure was in the mid-1970s, CDC figures show.

Dr. Tom Matte, a CDC epidemiologist, estimated that 12 million children under age 7 are exposed to high lead levels from paint in their homes. Tests show the higher the level of exposure, the lower the children's intellectual ability.

Matte said there are no current national figures on how many have suffered brain damage from the exposure, but at least 3 million children are believed to have blood lead levels above the 15 micrograms per deciliter known to be harmful.

**Dispute over cross heads to high court**

ROLLING MEADOWS, Ill. (AP) — The city council voted to take a dispute over the cross on its municipal seal to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Aldermen voted in closed session late Tuesday to petition the court to hear a lawsuit charging that a cross on the seal violates the constitutional separation of church and state.

"If anything it has to do with pride in what the city stands for and the history of the city," said acting Mayor Robert D. Taylor.

A federal appeals court last week ruled that crosses have no place on the seals of Rolling Meadows and another Chicago suburb.

Rolling Meadows is a western Chicago suburb with a population of about 20,000. Zion, a town of 18,000, has said it plans to appeal.

Taylor said the council disputes the 2-1 decision of the 7th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, and believes residents want to maintain the seal.

**Briefly**

**Catholics take collection for war victims**

ROME — Imitating Jesus' acts at the Last Supper, Pope John Paul II washed the feet of 12 priests in a Mass celebrated before thousands of people Thursday.

During the Mass, Catholics were asked to perform an act of charity as Christ had done. A special collection was taken up for victims of the Persian Gulf War.

The Holy Thursday ceremonies marked the opening of the holiest period of the year for Roman Catholics, who commemorate the crucifixion of Christ and his resurrection on Easter Sunday.

At the evening Mass at the basilica of St. John Lateran, the pope knelt before each of the 12 priests. He poured water from a gold pitcher over their feet, then dried and kissed them.

He was imitating a part of Christ's Holy Thursday supper with his 12 Apostles before his death on Good Friday. The ritual symbolizes Christ's humility.

**Yugoslav leaders hold constructive talks**

SPLIT, Yugoslavia — Presidents of the six Yugoslav republics, under pressure from the West and at home, held "very constructive" talks Thursday on reshaping their crisis-ridden federation, an official said.

The leaders met as fears of civil war and military intervention subsided, at least temporarily, following an agreement by Yugoslavia's two main political rivals to try to avoid escalating the unrest. The federal army at the same time promised to stay out of politics.

The summit was at the Villa Dalmatia, a residence of the late President Josip Broz Tito. The delegates sat at a table marked with the flags of individual republics, not of Yugoslavia.

**Benin's new president goes to hospital**

COTONOU, Benin — President-elect Nicéphore Soglo was flown to Paris for medical care Thursday, four days before his scheduled inauguration, government sources said.

The 57-year-old leader, who defeated former Marxist dictator Mathieu Kérékou in elections Sunday, has been ill for weeks. A presidential spokesman said he was suffering from typhoid fever and an attack of sciatica, a nerve condition affecting the hip and thigh.

He said Soglo, a French-trained technocrat and former World Bank official, planned to return for his inauguration, scheduled Monday.

**Ex-Israeli leader urges stronger steps**

JERUSALEM — Former Prime Minister Menachem Begin said Thursday that Israel should keep the Golan Heights it captured from Syria and urged the government to take stronger steps to end knife attacks by Arabs on Jews.

It was a rare public pronouncement by Begin, 77, who has made few statements since he resigned as premier in September 1983 amid rising criticism of the Lebanon conflict.

**Swedes request information on lost plane**

MOSCOW — Soviet government agencies are searching their files for information about the fate of a Swedish Air Force plane that disappeared near the Soviet border in 1952, a Foreign Ministry spokesman said Thursday.

Vitaliy Churkin told a news briefing the search was requested by the Swedish government earlier this month.

The Swedish DC-3 disappeared in June 1952 over the Baltic Sea near the Soviet border. The fate of the plane and its crew has never been verified.

**Mali coup leader hailed as liberator**

BAMAKO, Mali — Lt. Col. Amadou Toumani Touré was hailed Thursday as a liberator when he visited the graves of people burned to death by soldiers in rioting that preceded his barracks coup this week.

Also Thursday, state media reported all 1,468 common criminals at Bamako's central prison escaped two days earlier.

**America, Iraq agree to account for MIAs**

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia (AP) — The United States and Iraq agreed Thursday to account for troops missing in action and to arrange for the return of remains of dead in the Persian Gulf War, the U.S. Central Command said.

The allied side also agreed that starting April 2 it would increase to 5,000 the number of Iraqi prisoners of war repatriated daily.

During a four-hour meeting at Riyadh Air Base, the U.S. representative, Marine Brig. Gen. Paul A. Fratangelo, gave the Iraqis information on four American MIAs.

The American official, who was not identified, also handed the Baghdad representatives a list and map locations of sites where Iraqi war dead were interred by U.S. forces, the command said.

A command spokesman said U.S. forces had interred 444 Iraqi soldiers at 55 sites. He said the U.S. data included the grid coordinates and the number of remains in each grave and other personal data, including names where available.

It marked the third time the two sides had met. A fourth meeting was set for April 11.

According to the U.S. military, the parties agreed to set up a committee to investigate all cases of persons missing in action or otherwise unaccounted for. It will also address issues concerning the return of remains of war dead.

Both sides also agreed to allow representatives of the involved parties to participate in on-the-spot investigations.

**Muslim cleric key to release**

SIDON, Lebanon (AP) — Israel's release of a Muslim cleric it kidnapped would be an important step to winning the freedom of Western hostages in Lebanon, an Iranian diplomat said Thursday.

"We ... hope that all the hostages, those in Israeli and other jails, will return safely to their families," said Mohammed Jawad Zamarian, Iran's charge d'affaires in Lebanon.

The release of Sheik Abdul Karim Obeid, a Shiite Muslim cleric kidnapped by Israeli paratroopers in south Lebanon in 1988, "will be very important" in winning the release of other hostages, he said.

Obeid is an activist of the pro-Iranian Hezbollah, or "Party" of God, which is believed to include most of the hostage-holding factions.

**Soviet pilots foil hijacking to Sweden**

MOSCOW (AP) — Aeroflot pilots tied up a passenger who tried to hijack an airliner to Sweden on Thursday and stored him in the forward luggage compartment until they landed in Kaliningrad, Tass reported.

The official Soviet news agency said the TU-134 airliner with 80

passengers aboard was flying over the Kaliningrad zone along the Baltic Sea when a passenger demanded the domestic flight reroute to Stockholm.

The aircraft landed in Kaliningrad on schedule, Tass said. The flight originated in the White-Sea city of Arkhangelsk and had a stopover in Leningrad.

### Stanford should not be trusted with research

Want to send your kid to Stanford University? It will cost you about \$18,000 a year.

And don't worry about your money going for frivolous purposes. You've already taken care of that.

Various federal regulatory agencies allege that over the past decade, Stanford may have overcharged the federal government \$180 million in research costs. And not just for extra test tubes and spare computers.

We taxpayers helped pay for the university's yacht, for faculty and VIP tickets to football games, for improvements to university President Donald Kennedy's residence - including furniture upholstery, lengthening Kennedy's bed, refurbishing his closet, and for flowers for Kennedy's and other residences on campus.

It's all part of overhead, the price Stanford and other universities charge the government for wear and tear on their facilities while working on government projects. Stanford charges 74 cents on the dollar. That's right. For every buck the federal government sends Stanford for research on new weapons systems, AIDS or particle physics, it sends along 74 cents more to pay for the cost of doing business on those projects.

If federal investigators are right, part of the cost of doing business for which Stanford billed the federal government included a wedding reception for Kennedy, running the nutcracker for-profit Stanford Shopping Center and taking the school's trustees and their guests on "retreats" to Lake Tahoe.

It's an outrage, but it's more. If one of the country's best institutions of higher learning is running a colloquium on how to play fast and loose with the federal treasury, what does that say about the values it is imparting to the people it educates?

Stanford isn't alone among the nation's elite universities in drinking deeply from the public trough. It's just a little more aggressive than most. And it's pretty clear that for the past decade, at least, nobody in the federal government has been paying much attention to what Stanford and other big-name, private universities have been doing with our money.

There have been worse abuses of public accountability, but none more fundamentally at odds with the public trust. Stanford should be excluded from new federal research contracts until it realizes that.

## Now they beat up on the truth in I.A.

There's a cliché that says, "There are lies, and then there are damned lies." The police chief of Los Angeles and the governor of California are getting awfully close to that second level of lying.

That's the only way to describe the current, concerted effort to make the vicious, unprovoked beating of a Los Angeles motorist look like a vendetta against Chief Daryl Gates.

It takes either patented foolishness or outright dishonesty for anyone to view the videotaped kicking and night-sticking of Rodney King and not recognize that something inside the LAPD is desperately out of control.

You just can't feel comfortable raining blows down on a defenseless, unarmed civilian, with more than a dozen other officers present, unless there is near-certainty that the incident will go unchallenged.

It was not the "aberration" Gates asserts - not when he has the unmitigated gall to be as paranoid as the incident "in spite of the fact" that King is "on parole and a convicted robber."

That statement would seem to indicate there is a special standard of justice for speeding violators who happen to have a record, be on parole, or meet some other negative criterion.

That standard was also implicit when Gates said he hoped that what happened would help King straighten his life out.

It is a lie to make King anything but the victim in this shameful example of blatant brutality.

It is a damned lie to paint the issue as a personal attack on Gates or police officers in general.

Gates said he didn't like bringing his work home and that coverage of this incident "brought it right into my home" and "hurts my kids and grandkids," and is "part of a hidden agenda to get me."

The lie seems to fester for that Rodney King brought home a bruised and battered body with multiple injuries, including 11 skull fractures and a broken ankle, on an alleged speeding violation - while Gates

complains about an ego problem.

And there doesn't need to be any hidden agenda to get rid of Gates:

- He is quoted as saying "drug users ought to be shot," ignoring the fact that addiction is a sickness requiring a doctor, not a firing squad.
- He says African Americans may die in police choke holds because they don't have "normal" necks. Even if he believed such a ludicrous assertion, the solution is not to blame the neck but to stop the choking.
- He called an accused killer "an El Salvadorian drunk - a drunk who doesn't belong here," as if it would be OK if a U.S. citizen had done the killing or as if only non-citizens commit murder.
- Getting rid of Gates would be an up-front, out-in-the-open, daily, public effort that includes changing the inherently dangerous system that makes it virtually impossible for him to be fired.
- California Gov. Pete Wilson is upset about "the attempted lynching" of Gates, but he wasn't quite so exercised about what easily could have been the attempted murder of an unarmed speeder.
- Any one of the blows to King's head could have been fatal.
- That's the thing about lying and damned lying: King almost gets beaten to death by uniformed police officers, gets a public hearing only because the incident was videotaped and has his criminal record used as a rationale for beating him. Yet, Gates says it's all about someone being out to get him.
- Now Wilson says a lynch mob is after the chief, and that Gates' past comments were just a matter of being "glib or flip." At the very least, Gates is insensitive and unresponsive. At the very worst, he is out of touch with the department he heads and the people he is sworn to serve.
- Gates says, "This incident is not something I would tolerate."
- But it would have been tolerated if it

hadn't been videotaped. It would have been someone "on parole and a convicted robber" making a charge of excessive force - a charge officers would have denied.

It's important to note that while only a few officers beat King, a dozen others watched, and not one reported what was shown in the video.

Saying that doesn't put all police, everywhere, in a negative light. But it should not require video recording of every arrest to realize there is a problem much broader and more endemic than just the Los Angeles Police Department.

The problem is not the officer, but the process of dealing with the officer.

That has to do with recruitment, training, assignment, isolation, counseling and accountability. It has to do with the inaccessibility by the public to the internal investigation process.

It has to do with power corrupting, with absolute power corrupting absolutely, and with the fact that police officers come from the same society we all live in.

In a heated human moment with adrenal pumping and almost certain impunity, almost anything can happen. That's what has to change. Gates apparently does not understand the problem and can't be a part of the solution. He should go.

And we should all recognize that Los Angeles police are not in the spotlight because they are necessarily the worst or the only offenders, but because they got caught.

## War is won, but America still lags

Proudly, so proudly, he drove down the street in his pickup truck.

Attached to the truck was a large American flag, snapping gloriously in the brisk Florida breeze.

"On the rear window was glued a smaller version of the Stars and Stripes.

A patriot, devoted to his nation and its precious freedom, was expressing his pride in America's magnificent victory in the Gulf War.

As in older times, America strutted her stuff. The American military and efficient American technology routed a villainous dictator.

Three cheers for the Red, White and Blue. No, I again.

As the patriot passed me, I glanced at the back of his truck and saw the big capital letters: MITSUBISHI.

Obvious to the irony, unaware of the contradiction, he drove on, basking in the attention of other drivers and passers-by.

"I know not what course others may take," he could have shouted, "but as for me, give me an American flag and an American truck."

The stunning victory in the gulf, especially the stellar performance of Patriot missiles, revived pride in U.S. technology.

The talk of revival may be premature, because American competitiveness in the world technology battle continues to lag.

It's such a tough fight out there in the world marketplace that a wide range of U.S. interest groups and think tanks are lobbying to make competitiveness the nation's top issue for this decade.

To illustrate the seriousness, consider this point made by Congressional Quarterly: To build a Patriot missile today, Amer-

ican contractors must rely on computer parts made in Japan.

So maybe the driver of the Japanese truck wasn't completely off the mark after all.

Japanese influence, rooted largely in its success at competing in the world marketplace, can be found everywhere, even inside the pride of America's war technology, the Patriot.

Not so long ago, an American company, Intel Corp., made computer parts for the Patriot.

An Intel lobbyist, speaking from the sting of a losing economic skirmish, advocates a critical new understanding: "Electronics," says Mike Matlach, "is the cradle of the information age."

It is Japan, after all, transformed itself into an economic superpower despite having not one drop of oil in its homeland.

No oil, but a superior work ethic and a willingness to grab someone else's invention and make it better. And then better and better.

America can't duplicate Japan's approach, and shouldn't waste time trying. It's a wholly different business culture, with some aspects repugnant to Americans. Singing the company song is just one Japanese tradition that clashes with Americans' inbred independence.

Yet Americans can't fall down passively and let the Japanese and others steamroll us into third-rate economic status.

The think tanks and lobbyists argue America should consider every law and

issue in these terms: Will it help the United States compete in the world economy? Some advocate a required "competitiveness impact statement" for all new laws. Maybe that's too much, given our overboard. Yet even the suggestion can heighten awareness of competitiveness, and how vital it is to this nation's well-being in a dog-eat-dog world.

President Bush has become more aware of this issue, and last fall the White House issued a "white paper" on technology policy.

Modest spending increases were proposed to help high-technology projects in their infancy, and to link the nation's largest computers.

White papers and modest spending won't accomplish the goal, but it's a start. Such groups as the Council on Competitiveness, the National Coalition for Advanced Manufacturing and the Computer Systems Policy Project can be expected to keep pushing their competitiveness agenda until they get proper respect. And action.

What would be the best approach, beyond issuing papers and spending a few dollars?

For the long run, there's no doubt. These big new groups should think small, as in improving first-grade education in America. And second grade. And all the rest.

Then, maybe, one day this country will be competitive again.

The proud driver with the big flag might even buy an American car.

# Jobless claims top half-million

# Market finishes routing quarter quietly

WASHINGTON — The number of new claims for unemployment benefits remained above the half-million mark for a second consecutive week in March, something that had not happened in more than eight years, the Labor Department said Thursday.

While the number of new claims can be erratic from week to week, analysts said the high levels suggested that the recession was continuing in March despite other, more optimistic reports showing a big jump in consumer confidence and signs of life in the housing industry.

In a separate report Thursday, the Commerce Department said consumer spending, depressed for months, rose by 0.6 percent in February, primarily on the strength of higher automobile sales.

The department said that 510,000 people filed initial claims for state unemployment insurance in the week ending March 16, after 519,000 claims filed in the previous week.

increase last September, but economists were unimpressed. They said the gain was primarily a reaction to the severe 0.6 percent spending drop in January.

They noted that Americans' income growth remained depressed last month, posting a 1.7 percent gain after having fallen 0.4 percent in January.

Disposable income — after-tax income — advanced after accounting for inflation, looked even more lackluster, rising by just 0.1 percent in February. It had fallen by 0.9 percent in January.

NEW YORK — The stock market turned in a mixed performance Thursday in a quiet finish to a rousing first quarter of 1991.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks slipped 3.71 to 2,913.86, completing the four-day week with a net gain of 54.95 points.

Advancing issues outnumbered decliners by about 5 to 4 in nationwide trading of New York Stock Exchange-listed stocks, with 859

up, 679 down and 507 unchanged. Volume of trading on the Blue Board came to 150.75 million shares, against 201.83 million in the previous session. Nationwide, consolidated volume in NYSE-listed issues, including trades in those stocks on regional exchanges and over the counter market, totaled 183.65 million shares.

Over the first three months of the year, the Dow Jones index climbed 280.20 points, or 10.64 percent.

That gain for the blue chips was far outstripped by many smaller stocks. The NASDAQ composite index for the over-the-counter market gained about 29 percent in the quarter, riding a wave of revived enthusiasm for long-depressed small growth issues.

In Thursday's activity many managers still seemed to be adding bits and pieces of stock to their portfolios as they prepared to make their first-quarter reports to clients.

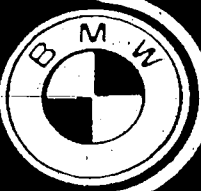

### Andrus to determine

#### Blaine district issue

**BOISE** - Now it's up to the governor to decide whether the Blaine, County School District can call for indefinite supplemental property tax levies.

The Senate on Thursday passed a House bill by a vote of 32-10 to allow certain school districts to ask voters to pass supplemental levies that would be incorporated into a district's base budget.

"This is indeed, I think, a practical solution to a problem that has plagued a few districts for a long time," said a co-sponsor of the bill Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly.

Only districts that have passed overrides that make up 20 percent or more of their maintenance and operations budget for seven consecutive years would qualify for the levy authority. Currently, only Blaine, Mullin and Wallace school districts would qualify.

Blaine County schools want the legislation because the high market value of property in that district means they receive comparatively little money from state coffers.

### Application for economic grant gets another signature

**JEROME** - County Commission Chairman Carl Montgomery co-signed an application Monday for an \$800,000 federal economic development grant for the Jerome Industrial Park.

Montgomery's action adds official county backing to the three-month-old quest for development money. Although the industrial park is located in the county, the city is requesting the money on behalf of the Jerome Economic Development Corp., which owns it.

If approved, the grant will extend a road through the park, improve sewer lines and upgrade a portion of the 100 South road.

### Bellevue residents have until end of day to register to vote

**BELLEVEUE** - Any resident who did not vote in last year's city elections must register by 4:30 today at City Hall in order to be eligible.

The elections will be held Monday at Bellevue City Hall.

Incumbent council member Dennis Wright and political newcomer James Matey are vying for the mayor's seat.

Three council seats will also be determined. The six candidates for the open council seats are: incumbent Emie Forbes, Monte Brothwell, Walter Cochran, Ray Cross, Richard Kimball, and Paul Mergenthaler. The polls will be open at City Hall from noon until 6 p.m.

### Idaho farmers to plant fewer wheat acres than last year

Idaho farmers intend to plant 360,000 acres of spring wheat, a 22 percent decrease from the 1990 level of 460,000 acres, according to the Idaho Agricultural Statistics Service. Winter wheat seedings of 870,000 acres are down 9 percent from the 1990 seedings of 960,000 acres. Spring seedings are expected to decrease to 750,000 acres from last season's 790,000 acres. Dry beans are expected to decrease by 40,000 acres to 140,000. Sugarbeets are expected to increase from 188,000 acres to 192,000. Nationally, spring wheat acreage is expected to decrease 12 percent. Barley acres are expected to increase 6 percent. Dry bean acres should decrease 14 percent.

### Burley teacher chosen to go to space academy in Alabama

**BOISE** - A Burley teacher has been picked by the Idaho Migrant Parent Advisory Council to attend the U.S. Space Academy this summer in Huntsville, Ala.

Alycia Guevara of Overland Elementary is one of two teachers who will join junior high students at a session scheduled during the first week of August. Rhea Gural of Mountain View Middle School in Blackfoot is the other. Four Idaho students chosen by the migrant parent council also will attend the academy this summer.

Warren Taylor, migrant education coordinator for the state Department of Education, said the students were picked on the basis of their performance in science and math, as well as letters of recommendation from teachers, parents and community representatives. The program is funded by the U.S. Department of Education.

## Arson suspected in O'Leary school fire

**TWIN FALLS** - Fire officials say they suspect an arsonist is to blame for a Thursday afternoon fire that caused several thousands of dollars in damage at Vera C. O'Leary Junior High School.

Someone stuffed rugs and rubbish through a bar fence and underneath two large circuit-breaker boxes, then lit the de-

bris, Battalion Chief Jerry Hafer of the Twin Falls Fire Department said.

The fire ignited the boxes and created a large blaze before firefighters arrived at about 1:10 p.m., Hafer said.

The fire destroyed at least one of the 480-volt circuit-breaker boxes and melted part of the venting grills, which are part of the building's ventilation system, Hafer said.

Judging by the fire's extreme heat, the

rugs had apparently been soaked with an "accelerant," although investigators detected no gasoline fumes, Hafer said.

The fire itself remained outside the building, but there was some smoke damage inside, he said. The school was empty because students are on spring break this week.

Hafer said damage will probably not delay the school's reopening Monday. Principal Norman "Duke" Wiseman was un-

available for comment Thursday evening.

Earlier in the day, around 10 a.m., Wiseman put out a similar blaze set near a tree at the school, Hafer said. There were also about ten other sites where rubbish had been pushed through the fence in an apparent attempt to start more fires, he said.

Hafer said an investigation is continuing.

Hardziej's jet was the first of 12 to land at Mountain Home Air Force Base Thursday afternoon as members of the 366th

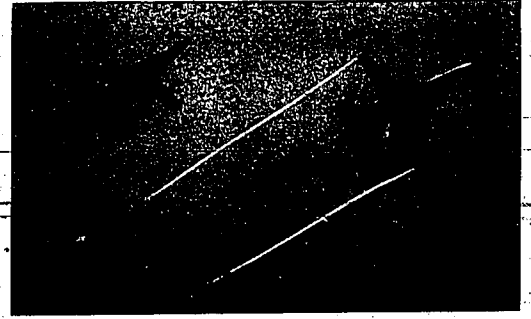
Tactical Fighter Wing returned home.

## Jerome police fear burglary suspect shot

**JEROME** - Jerome County law officials issued an all-points bulletin Friday following an attempted early morning auto burglary in which a suspect might have been shot.

Sheriff Larry Gould issued the bulletin to check hospitals in southern Idaho and northern Utah and Nevada for someone admitted with a 22-caliber gunshot wound. Authorities are looking for at least two suspects but Gould stressed he is not sure whether one of the suspects was shot.

According to a sheriff's report, an Eden man, John Harold Warren, reportedly was "wakened at 3:30 Thursday morning when someone with a flashlight was rummaging through Warren's 1981 Mercury Linx. Warren guessed the intruder to be a young man between 16 and 18 years old.

Warren grabbed his 22-caliber handgun and saw the intruder walk down an alley north of the home where he was met by someone driving an older four-

door sedan.

"Halt, put your hands in the air," Warren yelled as the intruder walked toward the car.

He fired a warning shot in the "general direction" of the car. The intruder jumped in air, shouted and got into the car, the sheriff's report stated. The car sped away.

Warren told the deputies he was not trying to hit the intruder when he fired the gun.

A gym bag, black vinyl bag and a plastic box were left in the alley by the suspect. The gym bag held a claw hammer taken from Warren's car, according to the report.

A voltage tester was taken from the black vinyl bag.

The incident lasted a little more than a minute, after which Warren called the police.

## Tire recycling bill makes it out of committee, onto Senate floor

**BOISE** - After a hearing spanning two days, a tire recycling bill went to the Senate floor on Thursday from the Health and Welfare Committee.

"We view this as a very pro-business, pro-conservation, pro-environment piece of legislation that really represents the professional way of government working with private industry to solve the problem," said

co-sponsor of the bill Rep. Deanna Vickers, D-Lewiston.

With the vote of Republican Sen. Russ Newcomb Twin Falls, Democrats shuffled the bill to the floor on a 6-4 vote. Four Republicans held out against the measure - Sen. Denton Darrington of Declo, Joyce McRoberts of Twin Falls, Chairman Rex Furness of Rigby and Stan Hawkins of Ucon.

## 4 pieces of college legislation fail

**BOISE** - Four for four. All the legislation stemming from an interim committee that studied community colleges has failed.

Thursday, the House voted down a bill that would have allowed community-college districts to levy a local option income tax. The vote was 32-41.

"I thought this one had the best chance," said Rep. Doug Jones, R-Filer, who sponsored the measure.

"But due to amendments, the bill wasn't voted on until the very end of the session, and it was too late for such a major piece of

legislation to pass. Jones said.

He said he'd try next year to resurrect the income tax bill, as well as a bill to establish a soda pop tax to raise funds for vocational education at the state's higher education institutions.

"The soda pop tax bill" died in a House committee this year.

Legislation calling for the state to fund 85 percent of community colleges' academic budgets and a bill calling for new committees to study improving vocational education services to local communities failed on the House floor.

# May trial date set for L.A. police

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Four police officers were ordered Thursday to stand trial May 13 for the beating of an unarmed black man that was captured on videotape.

The officers agreed to the trial date in a brief court appearance, but a defense attorney said afterward he might need more time.

Attorney Paul DePasquale said he thought the prosecution was rushing the case to trial, possibly because of publicity surrounding the March 3 beating.

"A question you might ask yourselves is: Are they pushing this case because it's the media football of the year?" said

DePasquale, who represents Officer Timothy Wind.

The defendants were escorted from the courthouse by sheriff's deputies and did not answer reporters' questions.

The beating prompted a nationwide Justice Department probe of police brutality and an FBI investigation of the division where the four Los Angeles police officers worked.

A grand jury is investigating the

conduct of 21 other officers who watched the beating.

Civil rights and community groups have called for an overhaul of the force and the resignation of Chief Daryl F. Gates.

Sgt. Stacey Koon, 40, and Officers Wind, 30; Laurence Powell, 28, and Theodore Briseno, 38, are charged with assault with a deadly weapon and unnecessarily beating a suspect.

Koon and Powell also are charged with filing a false police report. Koon is additionally accused of being an accessory in a cover up.

Among those who attended Thursday's hearing was the Rev. Al Sharpton.

"We're here because police brutality is here," the New York activist said. "The question is, why isn't everybody here?"

King, who has filed an \$83 million claim against the city, was beaten, kicked and shocked with an electric stun gun after being stopped after a high-speed chase. Doctors said his skull was fractured in 11 places.

George Holliday, the amateur

cameraman who taped the beating, has received offers for movie and television deals, said his attorney, James Jordan.

The attorney would not provide details.

Holliday, 31, said that since he sold the videotape to a television station for \$500, "I haven't been able to make my own decisions. I can't go everywhere I want to go anymore."

Two police officers who watched the beating told the Los Angeles Times that they are being dogged by the videotape.

"It's all I hear about," said one of two officers who spoke on condition of anonymity.

The other officer said he was "losing sleep" over the media coverage and investigations.

"The first thing you see when you close your eyes at night — and the first thing you see when you keep waking up all during the night — is that videotape."

# River sweeps away children

STOCKTON, Calif. (AP) — The second of five "sailing" boys swept into the rain-swollen Calaveras River while apparently wading along the shore was found drowned Thursday and a huge search was underway for his two missing brothers.

Elsewhere, two sailors were missing Thursday after being swept from their stalled jeep-like Humvee by an overflowing river at the Camp Pendleton Marine base in Southern California, officials said.

The five children, two sets of brothers, were apparently trying to reach a small island Wednesday evening when one lost his footing and pulled the others into the turbulent, chilly water, police said.

Sitha Soum, 10, managed to crawl out the 40-degree water. The body of his 9-year-old brother, Vanna, was recovered by divers about three hours after the accident.

The body of 7-year-old Charles Pich was recovered Thursday morning after being spotted in the middle of the current, near the University of the Pacific campus and about half a mile from where the boys fell in, police said.

"It was so quick I just didn't believe it," said a witness, 15-year-old San Pros. "One boy put his leg in the water and he fell in. They were holding hands and they all fell. I started to run to them and when I got there they just disappeared."

About 30 people, using helicopters and dogs, searched Thursday for Charles' two brothers, 9-year-old Herbert and 8-year-old Danalee.

Several dozen bystanders stood along the river as the mother of the missing boys, often weeping, watched the search.

The mother, Siheang Lim, performed a Buddhist prayer ceremony on the bank of the river, said Sgt. Michael Reis. The family, like many who live nearby, is Cambodian. Police could not explain why the mother and her sons had different last names.

The 10-year-old and one of the 9-year-olds could swim, authorities said.

By mid-afternoon, searchers had covered the entire 3½ miles to the water channel, which allows ocean-

going vessels to reach San Francisco Bay and the Pacific Ocean.

"I don't want to assess their chances," Reis said. "We are trying to maintain as much hope as we can."

He said a decision on whether to continue the search in the murky water would be made later in the day.

The accident occurred in a residential area near the center of the city.

The river, which normally is almost dry, was swollen by recent rains to about 20 to 30 feet wide. It was about 15 feet deep at the point where the children were swept away and flowing about 5 mph, Deputy Police Chief Ed Chavez said.

It had rained a little by Thursday, he said.

Pros said the area is popular with the area's children, although not with parents.

"I'll tell them (my children) there is danger here," said Van Nguyen, a mother of five who lives nearby. "I warn them about this place. I am scared of the danger."

# Police look into report Stallone crashed into photographer's car

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — Actor Sylvester Stallone and his bodyguard allegedly crashed their cars into a photographer's vehicle during a wild pursuit that began outside a Sunset Strip bar early Thursday, police said.

Stallone said the photographer was the bad guy in a chase that he said "was like an excerpt out of the 'French Connection,'" the 1971 movie thriller highlighted by Gene Hackman's car chase through New York City.

But the photographer, whose identity was not released by authorities, accused Stallone and his bodyguard, Gary Compton, of purposely crashing their cars into his after a confrontation outside the bar.

The police report, filed by the photographer and his companion, alleges assault with a deadly weapon, meaning the cars driven by Stallone and Compton.

Police said the incident would be investigated before the attorney general's office decides if it should

The photographer drove toward his Mercedes-Benz 500 SL, made an "obscene gesture" and within the next two minutes, "he hit the back, the front and then along the side" of the car, causing minor damage, Stallone said.

The police report says it was the bodyguard who approached the photographer and a companion, also identified as a photographer, around 2 a.m. as they sat in a car across from the bar, said Beverly Hills police spokesman Lt. Frank Salcido.

The photographer said they drove around the block, and when they passed the bar again, Stallone was sitting in the Mercedes.

The photographer said he drove away, but was followed by Stallone and the bodyguard, who was driving a Nissan 300ZX, Salcido said.

Both cars struck the photographer's car several times, he said.

The photographer's Honda Civic was moderately damaged on its left side, Salcido said.

# Pro-choicers say Dakota abortion bill faces veto

FARGO, N.D. (AP) — As abortion foes marched nearby, the administrator of North Dakota's only abortion clinic predicted Thursday that Gov. George Sinner will not allow North Dakota to enact the nation's toughest abortion ban.

"I have found him to be a thoughtful man who respects the views of others, even when they differ from his own," said Jane Boward, head of the Fargo Women's Health Organization. The executive director of the North Dakota Right to Life Association disagreed.

"I'm optimistic the governor won't veto the bill," Carol Long said after the state Senate passed a bill Wednesday banning abortion except in certain cases of rape, in-

cest or when a woman's life is in danger. The bill, approved 32-21, is expected to reach the governor's desk Tuesday. He will have three days to veto, sign or allow it to become law without his endorsement.

About a dozen people on Thursday picketed the abortion clinic, a regular occurrence, as another half a dozen abortion opponents marched outside the hotel where Boward was holding a news conference. After several attempts by protesters to interrupt the meeting, Boward said that the door be locked so she could continue. The 62-year-old governor, who has 10 children and once planned to be a Roman Catholic priest, has said he is personally opposed to abortion.

**L.A. mayor says he can't fire police chief**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Because he was black and because it was 1940, Los Angeles police Officer Tom Bradley was not allowed to ride in a patrol car with a white colleague.

Now he is mayor of the nation's second-largest city, and still there are things he cannot do when it comes to the Los Angeles Police Department.

Like remove Chief [Daryl] F. Gates. "When I explain this, especially to elected officials in other parts of the country, they're astonished," Bradley said in an interview Wednesday. "They cannot believe that the mayor doesn't have the power to simply say 'You're dismissed, you're gone.'"

Under the city charter, only the civilian Police Commission can appoint or move to fire the chief. To remove Gates, the city's Civil Service Commission must uphold findings of misconduct or neglect established by the Police Commission.

Gates has been under fire over the videotaped beating March 3 of black motorist Rodney King. He was struck with nightsticks, kicked, stomped and shocked with a stun gun after being pulled over for speeding.

Four LAPD officers have been charged with assault and brutality; 17 other members of the force were reported to have been present during the beating.

Politicians, community activists, civil rights groups and hundreds of

residents want Gates to quit. So does Bradley. But true to his measured style, the mayor has never said precisely that.

Instead, he has said the city's "healing process cannot begin as long as Daryl Gates is in office."

If Gates were to leave his appointive office, Bradley said, "I think there would be relief that the controversy — the charges and counter-charges and demands would be at an end. The department could get back to its job."

Now, with a new racial controversy dragging down the department and hurting the city, why not just come out and ask the chief to resign?

"First of all, I don't think it would change his attitude or mind at all," the mayor laughed. "If anything, I think it might cause him to get his back up higher than it is now."

Gates has refused to step down. On Wednesday, he announced a series of reforms and reviews designed to salvage his department's tarnished reputation.

Bradley said he was pleased by Gates' proposals but wondered why they hadn't been suggested before.

Since taking the mayor's office in 1973, Bradley has sponsored four ballot measures that would amend the city charter to give him and the City Council more power over department heads. Each measure failed.

The mayor said he will try again. June is the earliest such a measure could go on the ballot.

**Buffalo Bill-era guns are found stolen from historical park**

NORTH PLATTE, Neb. (AP) — Guns from the Buffalo Bill era were stolen from a state historical park Thursday, authorities said.

An alarm went off about 1 a.m. at the 18-room Scouts Rest Ranch, which William "Buffalo Bill" Cody established northwest of North Platte in 1878. A 39-year-old suspect was caught about an hour later, apparently hiding under a pickup truck, Lincoln County Sheriff's Sgt. Jerome Kramer said.

Authorities suspected there was an accomplice, and were continuing to investigate.

The stolen guns, worth about \$2,000, included lever-action 1873 Winchester rifles, a mint-condition 1866 Springfield used in buffalo hunting, and a shotgun.

**ACLU will refile prayer suit**

GRANGEVILLE (AP) — The American Civil Liberties Union has dismissed its lawsuit in U.S. District Court against the Grangeville School District involving prayer at graduation, with the intention of re-filing in 2nd District Court in Grangeville within a week.

ACLU attorney Stephen Pevor of Denver said federal rules allow plaintiffs to dismiss their own suit if the defendant does not answer the original complaint within 40 days.

"We're going to be pushing this very rapidly and hopefully get a decision by the Idaho Supreme Court as to whether graduation prayer violates the Idaho Constitution," Pevor said.

He said he hopes to have the matter resolved before graduation in the district in May because one of the defendants is a senior at Grangeville High School. The suit was filed on behalf of Phyllis Wright Harris and her three children of Grangeville.

**Small quakes hit San Bernardino County**

ONTARIO, Calif. (AP) — Two small earthquakes rumbled beneath the city Thursday, but they weren't strong enough to cause damage or injuries, authorities said.

The first quake, which registered 2.4 on the Richter scale, hit at 4:15 a.m. and the epicenter was four miles southeast of Ontario in the

southwest corner of San Bernardino County, said Robert Finn, spokesman for the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena.

A second, 2.2-magnitude quake, came at 9:36 a.m. in the same location. Quakes up to magnitude 3 usually produce little damage, if they are felt at all.

Rebels claim Iraqi troops launch assault on Kirkuk

DOHUK, Iraq — Kurdish rebel leaders said Iraqis raced Thursday around northern Kirkuk after Saddam Hussein's forces launched a massive air, rocket and artillery attack on the rebel-held oil center.

The official Iraqi news agency, monitored in Nicosia, Cyprus, said Kirkuk had been cleared of rebel forces and pictures of the city were broadcast on Iraqi television.

It said Izzat Ibrahim, vice president of the ruling Revolutionary Command Council, toured the city. There was no immediate comment from the Kurdish resistance. Rebel leaders in this city of 230,000 in the heart of Iraqi Kurdistan said fighting was fierce around several Kurdish cities. Dohuk was still firmly in Kurdish hands, despite Iraqi claims to have recaptured the city.

Latif Rashid, a spokesman for the Iraqi Kurdistan Front in London, said people had been killed in the fighting, but he did not know how many.

Kirkuk, a city of 200,000 residents was captured about a week ago by rebel fighters. The city is 150 miles north of Baghdad and is the most important city in the hands of Kurdish rebels fighting to topple Saddam.

Rashid said the Iraqi army used Soviet-made MiG and Sukhoi aircraft, as well as helicopter gunships, light airplanes, surface-to-surface missiles and artillery to dislodge the rebels.

United States has shot down two Iraqi jets, saying they were flown in violation of the cease-fire in the Persian Gulf War.

In Washington, State Department deputy spokesman Richard Boucher said the Iraqi government had begun a "major assault" against Kirkuk.

where he said buildings and other facilities had already suffered significant damage.

Clashes between loyalist troops and rebels continued elsewhere in northern Iraq, he said.

Iranians say Kurds in the north and Shiite Muslim rebels in the south began after Saddam's defeat at the hands of the U.S.-led allies in the war.

The Kurdish Democratic Party, one faction united in the hands of Iraqi Kurds troops were missing near Saddam's hometown of Tikrit for an assault on Kirkuk. Tikrit is about 70 miles southwest of the oil center.

Refugees and coalition officials had earlier said Saddam appeared to have stifled rebellions in the south of Iraq, but was having a tougher time with Kurds in the north.

The official Iraqi News Agency reported earlier Thursday that loyalist forces had recaptured Dohuk, about 25 miles south of the Turkish border. But rebels laughed when they heard the account. Rashid said the report "was southward, attempting to flee fighting between the rebels and the forces of Saddam Hussein."

Hall said the situation was initially "fairly calm" but "after several weeks of the occupied zone, shortly after the hostilities ceased, since most residents had shelter and food, though U.S. forces provided medical care and other forms of aid."

Iraq's Saudi-based rebel radio station and the rebel Shiite Dawra party reported fighting and air attacks in Dohuk province.

State-run news media in neighboring Iraq, which sympathizes with the Shiite rebels, said there were reports of continuing skirmishes in the south.

Iran's official Islamic Republic News Agency said Shiite Muslim insurgents claimed to have recaptured the southern holy city of Karbala. Control of the city has passed back and forth several times in the past month, but was last reported firmly in government hands.

Tehran radio said residents of the southwestern Iranian city of Khorramshahr reported hearing tank fire, artillery and air attacks Wednesday night and Thursday morning echoing from the nearby Iranian city of Basra.

The radio also quoted refugees entering Iraq Thursday as saying government forces were using helicopter gunships to bomb Basra and other southern cities.

The daily page said in a statement issued in Syria that Iraqi warplanes were attacking dissidents in the Shiite holy city of Karbala.

It also alleged "criminal massacres" were taking place in the southern city of Qurna — reputed site of the Garden of Eden — in revenge for residents' support of the uprising. Apparently referring to Iraq, the Iraq Army newspaper Al-Qadisiya on Thursday warned Iraq would settle scores with neighbors who have sided against it.

"The Iraqi people, army and command will not forget to settle scores with these countries," the newspaper warned.

Iraqi-refugees continue to flood occupied zone

WASHINGTON — U.S. military forces in the occupied zone of southern Iraq are attempting to cope with 25,000 refugees and a flood of displaced persons is growing, the Pentagon said Thursday.

"I think that we have an obligation, a humanitarian obligation to try to provide food and medical care, essential care for these people coming in. And that's not easy," said Bob Hall, top Pentagon spokesman, "Are we concerned about what's going on in Iraq? Yeah. I mean, it's a tragedy."

U.S. forces have begun distributing food, water and medical assistance to those Iraqis streaming southward, attempting to flee fighting between the rebels and the forces of Saddam Hussein.

Hall said the situation was initially "fairly calm" but "after several weeks of the occupied zone, shortly after the hostilities ceased, since most residents had shelter and food, though U.S. forces provided medical care and other forms of aid."

But the number of refugees at the border town of Safwan now amounts to 25,000, Hall said. "The number 'is' growing, but it's growing because of what's going on inside Iraq," he added. The spokesman cited reports from Safwan of food riots involving women, children and the elderly, and the problems of riot control encountered by allied forces.

"Now we have a refugee problem that's growing, and we had to work out exactly how we were going to try to deal with that," he said. "The U.S. forces intend to fulfill their obligations under the Geneva Conventions to assist refugees inside the occupied zone. But, he added, "We don't intend to stay permanently."

Under international law, U.S. and allied military forces are required to assist refugees and help provide for their health and welfare. But U.S. officials are leery of adopting the role of occupying forces and taking over functions of an interim government.

Hall said the refugees appear to be fleeing the destruction of their civil war, and that all are required to give up any weapons before entering the refugee camps.

Allied contributions to war at \$28.7 billion

WASHINGTON — Allied contributions to the cost of Operation Desert Storm total about \$28.7 billion, the Pentagon spokesman said. Bob Hall said, the major contributors included Japan at \$7.28 billion; Kuwait, \$7.01 billion; Saudi Arabia, \$6.924 billion; Germany, \$4.721 billion; United Arab Emirates, \$2.49 billion;

and South Korea, \$78 million. The White House said earlier this week that the cost of the war would far exceed the \$54.5 billion pledged by allies.

Gen. Colin Powell, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, has said the total war costs will be \$60 billion or \$65 billion. But congressional budget analysts have pegged war costs around \$40 billion, an estimate that raises the possibility the United States could make a profit. President Bush has signed a bill authorizing spending \$15 billion on the war, but the actual appropriation of funds is still pending. The prospect that the U.S. could profit from the war has angered some Germans. 



# Historical society sponsors symposium on archaeology

**KETCHUM** — The Ketchum-Sun Valley Historical Society along with the Community Library is sponsoring a symposium for the month of April in honor of Idaho Archaeology Week.

"The Culture History of Southern Idaho: A Glimpse into the Past, with an Eye on the Future" will take place at 7 p.m. Thursdays throughout the month at the Community Library's Lecture Hall. The final lecture will take place at 6 p.m. April 30 at Elkhorn Resort. All lectures are open to the public free of charge.

The first of the four lectures is set for April 4. Renown cultural anthropologist, archaeologist and Boise State University professor Dr. Max Pavese will shed light on the more fascinating aspects of southern Idaho archaeology, including the prehistory of the Hell's Canyon Rock Shelter and Birch Creek Valley.

On April 11, the state of Idaho archaeologist Dr. Thomas Green will focus on the importance of cultural preservation in resort communities. The lecture should be especially useful for city officials and the general public who are concerned about the future of rural, western resort towns.

On April 18, Dr. Richard Holmer, director of the Idaho Museum of Natural History at Idaho State University, will present his views on the various theories pertaining to the migration of Northern Shoshone into Idaho.

The April 25 lecture features a discussion of the Mung Tung Site in the Snake River Canyon by Ron James, a Twin Falls native and history teacher at Robert Sturair Junior High School. James' interest in and professional commit-

ment to the culture history of the Twin Falls area, particularly his avid research into the Chinese settlements of the Snake River Canyon, will be the focus of his evening presentation.

The final lecture, set for April 30, is the "Tukoaaku Territory: A Forgotten Encampment at Elkhorn Springs, Sun Valley." Weather permitting, an informal gathering will first be held at the site along the Elkhorn Gold Course followed by a lecture at Elkhorn's Horizon Room.

The evening's guest lecturers include David Corliss from the U.S. Forest Service in Prineville, Ore., and members of the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes from Fort Hall.

Corliss will reminisce about the scientific excavation he directed at Elkhorn during the early 1970s and will show slides from the dig. The photographs depict the Elkhorn Valley and spring site before development.

Emaline George, a descendant of the Lemhi Shoshone, people who used to inhabit the Salmon River area, will be on hand to answer questions about the Northern Shoshone and the exhibit pertaining to her ancestors.

In 1989, Gov. Cecil Andrus proclaimed Idaho Archaeology Week as part of a nationwide effort to promote public programs in archaeology. Support for this series comes from the Ketchum/Sun Valley Historical Society, the Community Library, the Idaho Humanities Council, the cities of Ketchum and Sun Valley, Blaine County Community Education, Blaine County Commissioners, the Bureau of Land Management, and a number of other local private and public organizations.

# At long last love is found in 'Green Card'

**HOLLYWOOD** — A moviegoer starved for tenderness might just consider "Green Card," an effortlessly engaging love story whose ace in the hole is the almost indecent magnetism of Gerard Depardieu.

## Review

Peter Weir, the film's writer-director-producer, wrote "Green Card" especially for Depardieu with what seems a seismographic understanding of the actor's warring qualities: brutishness and delicacy; elegance and scruffiness; innocence and worldliness; masculinity and femininity.

Depardieu plays this hand-tailored character with presence enough to stop a tank, which may make "Green Card" his English-language breakthrough for Americans who have somehow missed his almost 70-foreign-language films.

His foil here is Andie MacDowell, whose projection of tremulous virtue verges on anachronism — she seems to belong to the era of the blush and the fan. Weir may think so too, he's named her Bronte, one of a big family whose members have all been given writer's names. Bronte's career is horticulture and therein lies the catch that cheerfully opens the movie.

She's fallen in love with an Upper East Side apartment whose secret is its roof greenhouse, magnificent but tragically neglected. The fussy, elderly apartment-board members, however, want only a married couple. On this side, there is Depardieu's George Faure, a sometimes composer who needs a green card to remain and work in the States. With a nod from the agreeable screenwriter, it's done.

The charm of "Green Card" (rated R) is that it works even when we appreciate the calculation that's gone into what a fairy tale it is. Yet the film is so civilized, so modest and it has the wit to work so against our expectations that it simply suckers us in.

Naturally, Bronte brings the neglected apartment to life, transforming the solarium, planting her roof garden — busily — around — roof-bound — ferns — Naturally — Immigration

ings Bronte's doerbell within weeks of her moving in — and after her explanation to her nosy neighbors (Jessie Keosian, in particular) about her husband's trips to Africa. And naturally, her lawyer's advice is that she must find George and the two of them must appear to be man and wife, sharing the apartment for a week of high-intensity cramming before an in-depth Immigration interview.

A soulful Frenchman, a skittish, beautiful-American, think you can predict what happens? Then you've underestimated Peter Weir.

He seems to have written the role as much for MacDowell as Depardieu. As opposed to George's up-bringing in the Paris streets, Bronte is the quintessential New York romantic idealist. She dresses out of the Clifford and Wilts catalog; coarse straw hats, flowered flannel nightgowns, not a waistline in sight. Sports a boyfriend (Gregg Edelman) of impec-

cable dullness. If the truth be told, Bronte's a trifle root-bound herself; her pretty-pretty apartment almost cloying, her perfection dangerously close to priggishness.

The portrait of Bronte is given an extra dimension by "Green Card's" impeccable production design (Webby Sites), art direction (Christopher Nowak) and costumes (Marilyn Matthews) that illuminate every facet of her character. In a season of towering design achievements — "The Sheltering Sky," "Dante of the Varnishes," "Godfather Part III" — this small-scale but no less perfect work seems worthy of special attention.

George is very nearly the bull in Bronte's china shop — his cigarettes, industrial strength coffee and sheer bulky masculinity stir emotions in her that she thinks of as distaste. Yet on some level he's broken through her implacable "niceness."

He's also French catnip to Bronte's

closest friend Lauren (Bebe Neuwirth), who impulsively drags him to a small-dinner party her mother is giving — just a dozen of New York's richest and most powerful movers and shakers. It sets the scene for Depardieu's funniest moment and most inspired bit of improvisation. Depardieu and MacDowell seem to share an uncommon honesty and generosity of spirit. So as the sexual tension between their characters grows, their scenes together are charmingly open and uncompetitive. The scenes that if these two ever become lovers, it will be because they have first become friends. On that startling note, in today's climate of explicit, loveless love, the film floats to its heady conclusion.

# 'Hard Way' has all the cliches down for basic buddy thriller

## Capsule reviews

The following are capsule reviews of movies now playing in the Metro Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

**THE HARD WAY (R)** A big, bright, business-as-usual buddy thriller from John Badham. Two more mismatched cops, this time spoiled action star Michael J. Fox and wired-tight shamus Tom Selleck go through more violent squabbling and male bonding, while pursuing a serial killer (Stephen Lang). It's a symbolic mating; Fox and Woods stand in for L.A., with its palm trees, and New York, with its wise guys and mean streets — and they're the whole show here. With the right material, they could be dynamite. Here, the dynamic blows up all around them.

**DANCES WITH WOLVES (PG-13)** In his first directing work, Kevin Costner has made a clear-eyed authentic vision of the frontier Northwest that is irresistible. The story of a Union officer who becomes assimilated with a tribe of Sioux, it has all the elements of epic: vastness, astonishing action sequences, exotic-seeming characters but because it's more concerned with character than spectacle, its epic quality becomes engaging, never self-congratulatory. Beautiful, memorable and full of humor, it's one of the most winning films of the year.

**HOME ALONE (PG)** A 7-year-old child (Macaulay Culkin) is left behind by his parents when they jet to Paris for Christmas. Left to his own devices, he piggies out on junk food and foils a pair of bumbling thieves (Joe Pesci and Daniel Stern). Some of the low-comic slapstick wisecracks on a trifled (Three Stooges level), but the basic idea — an abandoned child defending himself against intruders — is a bit too seamy for comfort. Chris Columbus directed from a script by — who else? — John Hughes.

**KINDERGARTEN COP (PG-13)** The gentling of Arnold Schwarzenegger: first presented as a stubbled, lone-wolf cop with a taste for vicious vigilante tactics and gradually tamed into a family-loving pussycat-by-his-undercover-surveillance job as a kindergarten teacher. The last word in glib, shallow, soulless, spariouly warm-hearted commercialism. Director Ivan Reitman and his usual consortium of writers barely miss a trick or a marketing hook. Of all the recent "trailer" movies — films that resemble elongated trailers — this may be the most foolproof.

**SHIPWRECKED (PG)** Pleasing traditional, high-seas adventure for children, adapted from a 19th-century Scandinavian classic and directed by Oscar-nominated "Pathfinders" Nils Gaup. Little to divert adults, however. Siam, Smetstad stars as a 14-year-old Norwegian ship's boy confronting wicked pirate Gabriel Byrne.

**THE SILENCE OF THE LAMBS (R)** Thomas Harris' disturbing, mesmerizing book concerned an institutionalized psychopath who is used

## 'Mutant Ninja Turtles' leaps to No. 1 movie

LOS ANGELES (AR) — "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles II: The Secret of the Ooze" vaulted past "The Silence of the Lambs" to seize the No. 1 position at the weekend box office. The sequel to last year's film about the exploits of four crime-fighting turtles earned an impressive \$20 million in its first weekend but played at 1,200 theaters less than "Silence," which grossed \$6.7 million for second place, Exhibitor Relations Co. Inc. reported.

"Silence," starring Jodie Foster as an FBI trainee after a serial killer, held the top spot for two weeks.

The gritty drug-gang drama "New Jack City" sold \$4.4 million in tickets for third place in its third weekend. The film depicts the rise and fall of a Harlem drug lord.

"Class Action," a courtroom drama starring Gene Hackman and Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio, held onto fourth place with receipts of \$4.3 million. It was followed by the Julia Roberts thriller "Sleeping With the Enemy" with \$4 million.

"Dances With Wolves," Kevin Costner's epic Western, placed sixth with \$3.8 million in receipts.

The cop-buddy drama "The Hard Way" took seventh place, grossing \$3 million. It was followed by the enduring "Home Alone" with \$2.8 million.

Oliver Stone's "The Doors" dropped two notches to ninth place with a weekend take of \$2.3 million. The martial arts expert Jeff Spickard's "Perfect Weapon" was tenth with \$2.2 million in its second weekend of release.

**SLEEPING WITH THE ENEMY (R)**. A solid book has been inflated by overproduction and underwriting into thin melodrama to make a vehicle for Julia Roberts, playing an abused woman who tries to begin her life again. Patrick Bergin, uncharismatic as Sir Richard Burton in "Mountains of the Moon," is even more so here as her menacing husband. It's another fairy tale for as no more grueling than Roberts' job as a Hollywood Boulevard hooker in "Pretty Woman," and she attacks this role with the same bland compliance and dazzling superficial warmth.

# NBC counterprograms against NCAA championship with another Steel novel

As one of the world's foremost heart surgeons, Peter Hallam was a hero to both his staff and his patients. But Hallam's inability to persuade his seriously ill wife to agree to a much-needed transplant has left him a widower with three children. And there is also a great emptiness in his life.

"Peter is a devoted and loving father, but he is a grieving man," says Michael Nouri, who plays Dr. Hallam in Danielle Steel's "Changes," airing Monday, April 1, on NBC. "He is so broken by his wife's death that he just doesn't have it in him. He has not dealt with his grief, and his way of dealing with that pain was to avoid relationships and intimacy at the expense of his children."

As the subject of a television documentary, the Los Angeles-based Hallam meets Melanie Adams (Cheryl Ladd), a top television correspondent from New York City and herself the single mother of teenage daughters. Their instant attraction grows into love.

"When Peter meets Melanie, he is confronted with having to either give her up or deal with his grief," says Nouri. "That was the big change for Peter. He had to deal with the pain. The thing that was making him afraid of getting into a relationship. You can't go on to something new until you've cleaned out your closet. Because, if you don't, you'll take it with you into the new one."

"Melanie is a professional," Nouri continues. "There's no way that she is going to give up everything that

she has built. So you've got the perfect conflict. And yet when they meet, there are sparks."

After testing the waters with a family vacation, Peter and Melanie decide to get married. To be with Peter and his family, Melanie moves to Los Angeles. She is unprepared for the changes ahead.

"It's the coming together of grown-ups and how it impacts on their children," Nouri says of the story. "It's not 'The Brady Bunch.' It doesn't have a gratuitous happy ending. There's a lot of conflict and there are some surprises that I'm happy they put in."

"Changes" is set to air opposite the NCAA Basketball Championship on CBS. NBC continues its counter-programming strategy against major sporting events that began last October, when the network slotted productions of two other Steel novels,

"Kaleidoscope" and "Fine Things," opposite the 1990 World Series.

"Well, it depends on who's wearing the pants that night," says Nouri, jokingly, when asked whether romance or basketball will take the night. "A lot of people have tape machines, and there is more than one TV set in households today. They're just going to have to work it out."

Nouri's next project is already set: On April 7, he will serve as Ambassador to the National Sclerosis Society. "On that day, there's a walkathon to raise money," says the actor. "That will hopefully make a big difference."

**Q:** How can comic Jackie Mason afford to abandon a hit Broadway show to go to Israel? Is he that well off? — F.H.

**A:** Jackie is a funny — meaning somewhat strange — guy who claims that money "isn't that important to me." That's why he took off from his popular one-man show on Broadway to visit Israel during the thick of the Gulf War action, when Israel was the target of missiles. Mason says he was so concerned about Israel that he couldn't continue to tell jokes on the New York stage. And besides, he adds, "I blew all my money all my life. I never worshipped it."

**NO PAYCHECK:** Money alone is not the lure for Hollywood's megastars. Some very unusual deals are being structured these days. One of the most unique involves Arnold Schwarzenegger's fee for starring in "Terminator 2." For the sequel to his box-office hit, Schwarzenegger has been given a \$14 million jet by the producers in lieu of salary. Does this mean that his agent gets to use the plane 10 percent of the time?

**Q:** Any idea how much filmmakers have to pay to use hit songs such as "Pretty Woman" and "Stand By Me" in their movies? — T.E.

**A:** The right to include a song in a movie can cost producers anywhere from \$15,000 to several hundred thousand dollars. A number of fac-

tors determine the cost: the song, the artist performing it, is it currently popular, is it a major film, will the song be heard in the background or will it be played over the title and/or end credits and how often will it be played in the film. The highest known song fees were paid to use the Cyndi Lauper hit, "Girls Just Want to Have Fun," in the 1985 film of the same name. The producers will only say that the cost was between \$500,000 and \$750,000. It should be noted that the version used in the film was sung by someone other than Lauper, as that would have raised the price even higher.

**ROYAL FLUSH:** Maybe you felt sorry for European-born clown David Larible after reading in a supermarket tabloid that he was snubbed by Prince Rainier of Monaco. But that was only half the story. Larible, who's headlining the new Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus, was crushed when he was personally invited by Prince Rainier to a Monaco bash — and was then totally ignored by the prince. But, he says, "Princess Stephanie came to my rescue by introducing us. It turned out that her father, who'd seen my act, didn't recognize me without my makeup. The prince threw his arms around me and apologized profusely, saying, 'I've been asking everybody where you are, and here you are. My face must be as red as your clown nose!'"

# Has 'Dudley Dooright' gone wrong?

The game in daytime is never give audiences what they want. As Britain's Charlie Shaughnessy, who plays Shane Donovan on "Days of Our Lives," says, "The idea is to drive viewers batty with frustration, and finally give in, so you can lean back for a cigaret."

The ploy is paying off for Charlie's Shane while he messes around with wife Kimberly's sister Kayla. Fans are irate and refuse to believe Kimberly when she proclaims the relationship with Shane is over.

According to Shaughnessy, viewers feel Shane has gone astray, falling for the wrong woman. Shane used to be a much admired fellow, but that feeling is turning the other way.

Charlie takes this character tinkering with good humor. He knows the soap rules on keeping viewers hooked. "Kayla's mail isn't so one-sided. It's almost 50-50 this winter."

On the soap for seven years now in a role scheduled to last a month or so, the English actor, schooled at Cambridge alongside Peter Cook, is thrilled by the steady work.

For actors jobs are scarce in Britain. Like Peter Cook and Dudley Moore who ventured west, Charlie, son of Alfred Shaughnessy, writer and script editor of the wonderful "Upstairs Downstairs" series, gambled on work in Hollywood after falling in love with a Californian, Susan Fallender.

With blessings from "Days of Our Lives," the Shaughnessys have a baby son, a house in Santa Monica, and lead the good life.

"I miss England," Charlie admits, "but each time we visit my parents I feel more out of place in my native country. I guess I'm turning into an American. One thing I don't intend to lose is perspective. I can't take this life seriously. Coming from Europe we realize acting isn't the end-all. Your young people take the business much more seriously."

With his outsider eye, Charlie worries about economic strength here and in Britain after the excesses of the '80s, and he doesn't know how we're going to solve all the inequities, the unemployment mis-

eries and the drug plague. But he does know these issues don't fit in the soap world. Fans tune in to forget, not to seek solutions.

As for Shane Donovan, Charlie doesn't mind the latest plot turn. "Shane used to be Dudley Dooright, the European mystery man with an accent. Fans liked the newcomer and his quaint, stiff upper lip. The game was to slip inside this cold fish and see what really went on. Now Shane's reserve is slipping, and viewers are uncomfortable."

Charlie isn't. He just went out and bought a convertible, a life's dream, and he laughs all the way home from Hollywood stages to lovely Santa Monica.

### CHANNEL CHATTER

"As the World Turns" turns 35 on April 2. It was the first original soap opera for TV that did not have its roots in radio. It also marked a departure from the 15-minute running time of soaps -- it premiered on April 2, 1956, as a half-hour entry and has since gone to an hour. The soap has won a number of Emmys, and Helen Wagner, who portrays Nancy Hughes, is the sole surviving original cast member. Celebrating 30 years on the show is the illustrious Eileen Fulton, who portrays Lisa Donnington as Dr. Bob Hughes (the character was 12 when the show premiered) and

# NBC regains 1st in network ratings

LOS ANGELES (AP) — NBC regained its No. 1 ratings status on the strength of prime time programs that captured five of the top 10 slots in the weekly ratings race.

CBS' Sunday night newsmagazine "60 Minutes" was the most-watched program, while NBC's "Cheers" and "L.A. Law" finished second and third, respectively, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

Rounding out NBC's strong prime-time showing was "A Different World" and "In the Heat of the Night," which tied with CBS' "Murphy Brown" for seventh place, and "The Bill Cosby Show," which finished tenth.

Altogether, 10 of the week's top 20 programs were NBC products, including "Golden Girls," "Empty Nest," "Unsolved Mysteries," "Matlock" and "Wings."

NBC won the overall network race with a 13 average, followed by ABC with 12.4 and CBS with 11.5. Each ratings point represents 931,000 households.

The usually first-place NBC lost the ratings battle last week to ABC, which was bolstered by a Barbara Walters interview with allied forces

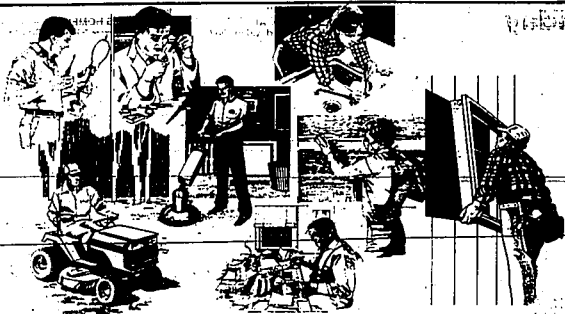

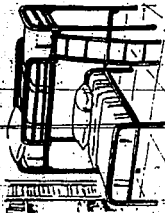

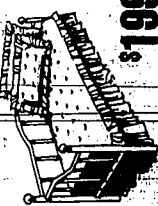
