Clashes erupt over war conduct

Bush denies Powell opposed military action Lack of U.S. help derailed Iraq coup

WASHINGTON — President Bush shrugged off allegations Thursday that Joint Chiefs of Staff had counseled against military action in the early days of the Persian Gulf crisis.

Bush, responding to excerpts from a new book by Washington Post assistant managing editor Bob Woodward, said that Powell has the "integrity and the honor" to offer candid advice and the discipline to "salute and march" when the president makes a decision.

Nevertheless, Bush appeared to confirm Woodward's assertion that Powell initially had opposed the idea of using military force against Iraq and had recommended an extended use of sanctions to push Saddam Hussein out of Kuwait.

According to the book, "The Commanders," Powell urged as late as October that a policy of "containment or strangulation" eventually would force Iraq to quit Kuwait, even though it might take as long as two years.

Bush said Thursday that he appreciated the frank advice he received from Powell and others who counseled

insiders in Washington, Bush added, "I feed endlessly — like piranha fish — on this kind of information," but he said such accounts are merely "little kind of nit-picking analyses after the fact."

WASHINGTON — Defections by senior officials in Saddam Hussein's army to a coup attempt against Saddam — were shelved in March because the United States failed to support the effort, according to a Senate Foreign Relations Committee staff report issued Thursday.

In early March, at the height of the rebellion in Iraq, the army officers approached a dissident group in exile with an offer of cooperation, said the report, written by Peter Galbraith, a senior aide to committee Chairman Claiborne Pell, D-R.I.

Student suit seeks use of school room by religious group

Fulls Junior High School students and their parents last week filed a lawsuit against the Twin Falls School District, hoping to gain access to school facilities for a youth Bible study group.

The lawsuit filed earlier this week in U.S. District Court in Boise claims district officials violated the students' constitutional rights when they refused to allow the prayer and Bible study group, Youth Alive, to use school facilities.

Plaintiffs in the suit are Robert Stuart Junior High School students — Sheila Slaughter, Patricia Hopcock and Ellen Hopcock — and their parents. David Hopcock and Bruce Slaughter called for such equal access, but Jeanne Hopcock declined to comment Thursday on advice of counsel.

The Slaughters and the Hopcocks could not be reached for comment.

Heavy Americans won't admit it

WASHINGTON — The number of overweight Americans adults has risen to nearly two out of three, and almost a third of those who are too heavy don't admit it, according to a private survey on the nation's health.

The report, released late Thursday, also says about two-thirds of adults regularly experience stress in their lives, but most are doing something about it — and about other health concerns as well.

A string of eight annual surveys by Louis Harris and Associates for Prevention magazine suggests Americans are making progress in reducing drug and alcohol use, getting regular medical exams, avoiding smoking and taking precautions against accidents at home

Bangladesh cyclone toll may top 100,000

DHAKA, Bangladesh — The bodies of thousands of victims killed in a devastating cyclone washed up Thursday on the shores of Bangladesh as the government struggled to provide relief to millions of survivors.

The official death toll for Tuesday's cyclone, the most powerful to hit this impoverished nation, is 37,543. But tens of thousands are missing on lowlying islands and coastal deltas and Prime Minister Khaledia Zia said at least 100,000 people, and possibly more, could have been killed.

"It is a vast devastation and the loss of human lives could exceed 100,000," Mrs. Zia said on state-owned television. "The information of Bangladesh is incomplete. We fear it (the toll) could go up much more. I pray to Allah, it's not true."

She announced special prayers would be held Friday, the Muslim Sabbath to mourn the victims, and that Saturday would be a national day of mourning.

Relief workers and journalists who visited the stricken region said thousands of decomposed bodies were being brought in by the tides. Survivors searched for missing relatives among the piles of corpses stacked up on beaches.

"I saw deaths, devastation, agony and misery of a magnitude I have never seen before," said one photographer who went to the area.

"The bodies were decomposed and the stench was unbearable."

As the number of bodies floating in increased by the hour, the government struggled to ferry food, water and medicine to the millions of survivors.

New book ranks West 1st in fidelity, last in virginity

Stenhouse was not surprised by the fidelity finding.

"The Marlboro Country" of the book with Denver as its capital includes Wyoming, Nevada, Montana, Utah, Idaho, western Colorado, eastern California, northern Arizona, western Oregon, western Washington and northwestern New Mexico.

Marlboro Country, roughly the Mountain West, has the most land and the fewest residents of all the regions.

"It is the place where the American Wild West myth still lives, where the home of rugged individualism and hard-sultry living."

"Residents will sometimes drive 100 miles to get some Canadian whiskey for their favorite alcoholic drink."

More than 2,000 men and women answered 1,800 questions during a one-week interviewing period across America.

An additional 3,700 people completed shorter interviews. By comparison, most national opinion polls sample 1,000 people, according to the book.





Weather summary

A moist and unstable airmass circulated into southern Idaho from an upper level low lying along the Nevada-Utah border, triggering a few rain and snow showers Thursday.

At the outer bounds of that moist air circulation, across Idaho's mid-section, fewer clouds were noted. Greater clearing was evident farther north.

"It was a little breezy" in the Gem State Thursday, particularly near the showers. A 23 mph Pocatello-reported wind gusts above 25 miles an hour; Idaho Falls 30 mph and winds of up to 40 mph at Malad City.

Temperatures around the state Thursday afternoon were in the 40s over the higher terrain, and in the 50s to low 60s elsewhere.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 67 degrees at Lewiston. Ketchum and Dixie reported the coldest at 22 degrees.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the highest temperature was 96 degrees at Lajitas, Texas. The lowest was 17 degrees at Fraser, Colo.

Elsewhere, clouds and light rain prevailed across the northern Atlantic Coast region.

Flooding continued in parts of Louisiana and Mississippi, and minor rains from the Jacksonville area. The Army Corps of Engineers said nearly 1.7 million acres of land mostly reseeded, had been flooded in Mississippi by recent storms.

Snow blankets Western mountains, rain over plains

Strong thunderstorms developed Thursday over the south-central part of the nation, and a storm system blew snow through the mountain states West.

Flurries and thunderstorms associated with a warm front extended over south-central Texas, and showers and thunderstorms developed across western Texas and western Oklahoma during the afternoon. Corpus Christi, Texas, got 2.35 inches of rain during the six hours up to 2 p.m. EDT.

A few showers also developed along a warm front curving through the central Rockies.

Another storm system approaching the central Rockies produced snow from Nevada to south-western Montana during the afternoon, and threatened to spread heavy snow into Montana and Wyoming.

Twister was on ground for 70 miles
WICHITA, Kan. - A tornado that killed 17 people and injured 100 others last week stayed on the ground for about 70 miles, according to preliminary findings released Thursday by a survey team.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration assigned an F4 rating to the April 26 twister, one of a total of 27 F2-F5 tornadoes rated F4 have wind speeds of 200 to 250 mph.

Only two of every 100 tornadoes would have the same strength and intensity, said David Imly of the National Weather Service's Norman, Okla. office.

The tornado touched down near Clearwater in south-central Kansas at 6:10 p.m., and traveled about 70 miles northeast to Cassoday before drifting back into the clouds shortly after 7 p.m.

Autopilot draws blame for plunge
WASHINGTON - Twelve years after a near-fatal 5-mile plunge by a Boeing 727, the pilot asserted Thursday that the cause was a fault in the plane's autopilot and not pilot error, as determined at the time.

Pointing to several similar incidents involving Boeing 727s in the past 12 years, retired TWA pilot H.G. "Hoot" Gibson called on the National Transportation Safety Board to make a fresh investigation of the incident.

Last month, the Air Line Pilots Association filed a petition asking the NTSB to investigate a possible autopilot flaw that may have caused nine similar 727 incidents since 1977.

The Boeing Co. released a statement Thursday saying the company "did not find anything to relate the autopilot to the 1979... incident" in repeated reviews of the system's design and operation. The company noted that the NTSB had rejected an earlier request to reconsider the incident.

Trustees going after Hunts' assets
DALLAS - Trustees liquidating the estates of Nelson Bunker Hunt and William Herbert Hunt are going after more than \$100 million in assets the former billionaires allegedly gave to family and friends just before filing bankruptcy.

The court-appointed trustees, Dale Pale and Steven H. Felt, filed a \$1.3-billion bankruptcy judge, Harold Abramson on Wednesday for permission to sue the relatives and friends who received the money.

Abramson, who presided over the 16-month Hunt bankruptcy proceedings, will rule on the motion after a hearing expected in the next few weeks.

Albert McGrath, an attorney representing the family members named in the motion, said Thursday he was reviewing it and had no further comment.

The trustees claim the Hunt brothers, in the months before their September 1988 bankruptcy filing, diverted personal wealth to keep it away from creditors.

Council asked to take larger role
PORTLAND - The Northwest Power Planning Council should assume a greater role in restoring salmon runs, Oregon Gov. Barbara Roberts told a congressional subcommittee Thursday.

There is no more urgent need, said the four-state region than the implementation of a winter recovery plan for the native salmon runs, Roberts said.

She presented Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., with the final report of the Northwest salmon summit, which brought 30 river users and other parties together to negotiate a recovery plan. She also made public the summit's program for 1991.

Hatfield established the summit in an attempt to avoid having salmon runs declared threatened or endangered species.

But because the plans do not go far enough, Roberts said, the Northwest Power Planning Council should continue the summit's work.

Formal probe of hostage deal sought
WASHINGTON - A former Carter administration official who spent two years probing stories of a secret deal between the 1980 Reagan presidential campaign and Iran said Thursday that only a more formal investigation can hope to tell the full story.

Gary Sick, a Middle East scholar who was on Carter's National Security Council staff, met for 1 1/2 hours with 10 House Democrats who are considering whether to open such a probe into charges that Reagan aides delayed the release of American hostages until after the election.

"My cause is to get the story out, to make people realize that something happened here that should not have happened," Sick told reporters after the meeting.

After two years of interviews and investigation, he said, he found a case "that simply can't be found out."

There are walls I can't break down, he said. Obviously, a more formal investigation could get over that hump quite a bit.

Louisiana explosion toll reaches 8
ST. LOUIS, La. - The death toll reached eight Thursday from a thunderous explosion at a chemical plant that is this town's economic life blood. Evacuated residents began returning to homes damaged by the blast.

Wednesday's explosion also injured more than 120 people.

Firefighters extinguished small fires that still were burning Thursday. State environmental officials checked air quality.

Alaska lawmakers reject settlement
JUNEAU, Alaska - The Alaska House rejected a \$1 billion settlement of Exxon Valdez oil-spill litigation Thursday, effectively killing the pact between Exxon Corp. and the state and federal governments.

Medicare fee increase recommended
WASHINGTON - The Bush administration recommended to Congress Thursday that Medicare fee for physician services be increased by 2.2 percent next year.

Health and Human Services Secretary Louis Sullivan also recommended that total spending on Medicare physician services be allowed to rise only 6.2 percent in fiscal 1992.

Sullivan said the double-digit increases in Medicare spending on physicians in recent years was more than the rate of inflation.

Woodward's book is due out on Friday but The Post ran an extensive article about it Thursday.

After the article appeared, Bush said he called Powell and told him, "If you have any angst (about the past explicitly and urgently warned story), forget about it. He said, 'I thought Hussein intended to seize the emirate. Powell urged Cheney to sound the alarm at the White House to get Bush to issue a public or private warning to Hussein. But Powell said he would not receive the intelligence assessment or failed to act upon it, the book says."

"The day after the invasion, Cheney, frustrated with Powell's reluctance to provide military options for the president, went directly to the Navy and Air Force for briefings on possible air strikes against Iraq."

"The initial plan of Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, the theater commander leading the ground force he had available was to drive right into the heart of Iraq's extensive fortifications along the Kuwaiti-Saudi border. The idea of a frontal assault was 'shredded' in a briefing given by a member of Schwarzkopf's staff to Cheney, Powell and the Joint Chiefs. The following day, Bush agreed that Schwarzkopf needed more troops and several months more time to prepare for the massive flanking maneuver ultimately adopted."

But the United States "continued to see the opposition in warfare, fearing that it would lead to a separate state and the Shia's expansionist Islamic fundamentalist regime."

Americans in their desire to kill, although he could not provide exact statistics.

"You would think the work ethic would be a lot stronger in the New England region," Kim said, "where there's a much stronger Protestant tradition."

"I don't know why people in Marlboro Country have less confidence in the future of America," Kim said. "That part of the country represents America's past, rather than the future."

Youth Alive access to classroom space after school hours after the district's attorney, Fritz Wonderlich, told the trustees that allowing the group into the school would violate the Idaho constitution.

Idaho law prohibits religious doctrines from being taught in public schools, Wonderlich said at the time.

He also recommended the district restrict every non-curricular group or club from using either school meetings or activities.

The School Board on Feb. 12 decided that instead of passing a new policy prohibiting non-curricular groups, it would wait to see if the district could curricular school club activities as curricular offerings.

The plaintiffs are seeking attorneys' fees and costs associated with the suit.

White House widens travel review

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House on Thursday widened its internal review of travel by top aides on military jets to probe the accuracy of records submitted by Chief of Staff John Sununu.

Presidential spokesman — Martin Fitzwater said Sununu had requested the expanded inquiry by White House counsel Boyden Gray.

Fitzwater said the inquiry would "cover all aspects of the travel and the reimbursement and make sure it was all done in the appropriate manner."

But Fitzwater said the White House

had no plans to review travel by Vice President Dan Quayle and defended his recent use of an Air Force plane for a golf weekend.

"The vice president of the United States flies on military aircraft wherever he goes. That is right and proper. And that will not change," Fitzwater said.


President Bush earlier asked Gray to review White House travel policy after disclosures Sununu had made extensive use of military aircraft for political and personal use.

But that review didn't include an

examination of details of Sununu's travel.

New questions arose after Sununu claimed as "official" business several Colorado ski vacations for which he did not reimburse the government for his own travel. For one of those trips, a ski lobbying organization picked up the tab for Sununu's wife Nancy.

In all, the government was reimbursed \$47,000 for Sununu trips that cost the government as much as \$500,000, according to figures released by the White House late last month.

Soil train arrives in Utah; still no hit with environmentalists

GRASSY MOUNTAIN, Utah (AP) — A train hauling 32 boxcars of contaminated soil arrived Thursday in the western Utah desert, ending its secretive search for a permanent disposal site.

The train stopped at a railroad siding about 85 miles west of Salt Lake City at about 6 a.m. Thursday, said Joe LaSala of U.S. Pollution Control Inc., which operates the 640-acre Grassy Mountain landfill.

There was no sign of demonstrators who have dogged the train on its course through several eastern states, including three that turned it away, and during its westward trip to Utah.

However, a handful of Greenpeace activists and representatives of the Sierra Club, the Audubon Soci-

ety and the National Wildlife Federation gathered at the State Capitol Thursday morning to demand that Gov. Norm Bangerter ban the shipment, although he said earlier he wouldn't do that.

"The governor and the state representatives need to rethink their open arm policies toward industries that are dumping hazardous wastes on Utah," said Cindy King of the Sierra club.

Workers clad in white chemical-resistant clothing and respirators used heavy equipment to unload the soil into dump trucks headed for the Grassy Mountain site about 14 miles north of the rail spur.

USPCL spokesman Joe LaSala said the soil was being tested to make sure it matched samples pro-

vided last week by CSX Transportation, which owns the soil, and early results revealed no differences.

"Given that we've unloaded 14 or 15 cars so far, and a confirmation has been made, we anticipate no problems," he said. The transfer was to be completed late Thursday.

The Florida-based CSX Transportation earlier refused to reveal the train's whereabouts due to demonstrations and bad publicity.

The 2,400 tons of dirt was scooped from the ground after being tainted with acrylic acid in a 1989 train fire in Freeland, Mich.

Acrylic acid is used in such products as dentures, contact lenses and auto paints. "It is a hazardous chemical, but not in the amount present in the soil, LaSala said.

Panel examines Neil Bush connections

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush's son Neil drew a salary of \$160,000 as a partner in his second money-losing oil company, in which he invested less than \$3,000, an internal report by a House committee shows.

The report by the staff of the House Small Business Committee examines the relationship between Neil Bush's second oil business, Apex Energy Co. of Denver, and two venture capital firms that financed it.

A copy of the report, which concluded there is no evidence of illegal

or improper conduct in Apex Energy's financing, was obtained Thursday by The Associated Press.

The venture capital firms invested \$2.3 million in Apex Energy in May 1989. At the time, they were controlled by Louis Marx Jr., an investor who is a big Republican contributor and a longtime friend of President Bush.

The firms, Wood River Capital Corp. and a subsidiary, Bridger Capital Corp., were able to draw on federally guaranteed money.

Rep. Pat Schroeder, D-Colo., called

the investment in Apex "a \$2.3 million embarrassment."

Schroeder said in a statement that the report, which she had requested in December, indicates "a shameful abuse of a small business assistance program."

Because of the two companies' serious financial difficulties, the Small Business Administration recently asked Wood River and Bridger to sell all their assets, including their stakes in Apex Energy, within 30 months. The proceeds will be used to pay back the agency for the loan guarantees.

Court backs anonymous AIDS testing

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — New York's highest court on Thursday upheld the state's confidential testing program for AIDS, rejecting a bid by four medical societies to have AIDS classified as a communicable disease.

State health officials praised the unanimous decision by a seven-judge panel of the Court of Appeals.

"Today's decision represents a triumph of science over fear," said Lora McBanette, the Health Department's executive deputy commissioner.

"But an attorney for the doctors' groups predicted the Legislature will address the issue."

Major pronouncement by Pope calls for economic, social justice

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Pope John Paul II on Thursday spelled out his vision of a post-communist world of economic and social justice, leaving room for capitalism — with a moral core — but no place for “consumer societies.”

His views were presented in his ninth encyclical, the Roman Catholic church’s first major pronouncement of social doctrine since the fall of East bloc Communist governments.

“Western countries... run the risk of seeing this collapse as a one-sided victory of their own economic system, and thereby failing to make necessary corrections in that system,” John Paul said.



In reality, he said, such a society “sees with fascination in the person that it totally reduces man to the sphere of economics and the satisfaction of material needs.”

Vatican officials said the pope didn’t have any particular countries in mind.

French Cardinal Roger Etchegaray, when asked at a news conference if the pope’s criticism might apply to the United States, replied: “It would be the worst direction to present this document as an anti-American document. Luxury societies...wasteful societies are found everywhere.”

Without naming them, the pope grabbed “some countries” that after World War II sought to “preserve free-market mechanisms” while providing “an abundance of work opportunities, a solid system of social security...to deliver work from the mere condition of a commodity and to guarantee its dignity.”

He seemed to be referring to West Germany after the war.

But he criticized “welfare” states, saying they rob society of “human energies.”

“It is necessary for peoples in the process of reforming their systems to give democracy an authentic and solid foundation through the explicit recognition of human rights,” he said, singling out the “right of the child to develop in the mother’s womb.” The church forbids abortion.

Encyclicals embody major pronouncements on issues of great concern to the church and the world.

The views should be especially applied in eastern Europe, which is “experiencing/serious lack of direction in the work of rebuilding,” said the Polish-born pontiff.

Church-linked and labor groups in the United States and Europe hailed the document for its emphasis on social justice and workers rights. Conservative groups also rejoiced in what they called the Vatican’s most forthright endorsement of the free-market economy.

John Paul acknowledged capitalism’s successes but denounced the system for sometimes “achieving them at the expense of the poor and of morality.”

John Paul asked rhetorically if capitalism should be the goal of Eastern Europe as well as a model for Third World countries “searching for the path to true economic and civil progress.”

“The answer is obviously com-

plex,” the pope wrote, saying capitalism could only be acceptable if it had an ethical and religious core.

“It is unacceptable to say” that capitalism is now “the only model of economic organization,” he said. “It is necessary to break down the barriers and monopolies which leave so many countries on the margins of development and to provide all individuals and nations with the best conditions which will enable them to share in development.”

Among his suggestions, “even cancel” foreign debt owed by developing countries.

In the encyclical the pope condemned what he called the “consumer society, which tries to prove it can achieve a greater satisfaction of material human needs than communism, while equally excluding spiritual values.”

Paper says Iran closer to restoring U.S. ties

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — A state-run newspaper said Thursday that the government wanted to form an alliance with Europe. One official said Iran also was moving closer to restoring diplomatic ties with Washington.

On the eve of a visit by French Foreign Minister Roland Dumas, the newspaper Tehran Times said Iran is undoubtedly the best candidate as an ally for Europe in the region.

“There doesn’t seem to be any-

major obstacle to the improvement of Iran’s relations with Western Europe as a whole,” it added.

German Foreign Minister Hans Dietrich Genscher was to visit Tehran on Monday.

The English-language daily was careful not to link the media official to President Hashemi Rafsanjani’s attempts to mend relations with the West. It said allying with Europe could help counter Washington’s “undeniably” strong presence “in the Persian Gulf.”

Israeli attack refugee camp

TYRE, Lebanon (AP) — Two Israeli helicopter gunships fired four rockets into a Palestinian refugee camp on the outskirts of the southern port city of Tyre on Thursday, police said.

In Jerusalem, the army said warplanes attacked a PLO guerrilla target near the Rashidieh camp. It gave no details, and there was no word from any of the sources on casualties or damage in the attacks, which began at 9:45 a.m.

Israeli army statements do not specify the type of aircraft, referring to all as “warplanes.” Lebanese police said two Cobra attack helicopters were involved.

Armenian says doctors blocked from treating victims of clashes

MOSCOW (AP) — Armenians injured in attacks by Soviet and Azerbaijani troops are dying because doctors have not been allowed to treat them, an Armenian lawmaker said Thursday.

The Tass news agency said Thursday an Azerbaijani was killed in the morning by guards during an armed

attack on a farm in the mainly Armenian village of Chaldran in the disputed region of Nagorno-Karabakh. In a separate incident, two Azerbaijani were killed when they struck a mine in the Gadrat district of Nagorno-Karabakh, Tass said.

Armenian Supreme Soviet said six Armenians who were seriously hurt before doctors could reach them. Vardanyan told a Moscow news conference that helicopters arrived Wednesday night carrying doctors to treat the injured, but Azerbaijani troops stopped them.

Allied forces push 50 miles deeper into northern Iraq

BUSHAK, Iraq (AP)—U.S., British, French and Dutch forces plunged 50 miles deeper into northern Iraq on Thursday, taking control of a zone that includes a bombed airfield and four of Saddam Hussein's opulent villas.

The push eastward, which the Iraqi government was notified about Wednesday, created a 70-mile strip along the Turkish-Iraqi border where Iraqi leaders who favored Iraq in the mountainous can return without fear, U.S. Lt. Gen. John Shalikashvili told reporters.

The zone extends south from the Turkish

border up to 30 miles.

Iraqi forces were withdrawing from the zone as allied troops advanced, Shalikashvili said.

"Everything is going very, very well," he said.

Moving out at 7 a.m. from the allies' original security zone around Zakho, 2,500 allied troops traveled in convoys of light-armored vehicles, jeeps, trucks and Humvees.

Encountering no resistance, the first cars reached their destination, the hilltop city of Amadiyah, at about 4:30 p.m.

En route, the allied force set up guard posts

and checkpoints and took control of a battered air strip near Sirsenk, which is expected to become a landing place for allied supplies.

Iraqi soldiers "have been seen and generally have moved past" toward the south, said Brit. Lt. Col. Graham Kerr, commander of an artillery regiment on the route to Amadiyah.

He estimated the Iraqis numbered "in the hundreds."

British Marines set up a command post facing a 12-foot-high walled villa complex with orchards and manmade lakes near Inishak. It

was crowned by a stuccoed, red-tile-roofed mansion belonging to Saddam Hussein.

Four miles to the south stood two more dramatic compounds belonging to the Iraqi leader. One house sat at a peak, over a sheer cliff dropping about 400 feet.

The second, looking something like a Caribbean resort complex, was built above a reservoir with a dam and a spillway.

A fourth mansion, combining Greco-Roman and Texas ranch-style architecture, was in the town of Sirsenk.

Numbers indicate payoff for education spending

In the last five years, Idaho has made an unprecedented \$2 billion investment in state spending for its public schools, and there are some tentative signs that it's beginning to pay off.

Statistics just released by the U.S. Department of Education show Idaho's improving in several key measures of educational achievement. For example: Between 1982 and 1988, the average teacher salary in Idaho rose 39 percent, from \$16,401 to \$22,860.

Idaho is still far below the national average in several important areas as average teacher pay, expenditures per pupil and advanced placement programs.

And although the state's taxpayers have spent millions hiring more teachers and building more classrooms over the last five years, Idaho's ratio of students to teachers — 20.6-to-1 — has barely budged since 1982.

Part of the problem is the position from which Idaho started the '80s — 45th in student-teacher ratios, at or near the bottom in a half-dozen other indices of educational quality.

It takes more than dollars to overhaul an education system. Idaho is doing better because citizens and legislators have a vision of what they want the state's education system to be. They are spending that extra money smarter.

Furthermore, what criminal who already knows he has a record is going to be dumb enough — knowing full well that he'll be checked out to the day he was born — to try to buy a firearm of any kind?

There is where the anti-gun groups should target, and also the news media — not the legitimate retail firearms trade or their customers — with all this unnecessary harassment and paperwork. There is no evidence that waiting periods prevent suicides or domestic homicides. Hardly any crimes could even theoretically be prevented by a cooling-off period.

The suggestion that people who transact in illegal drugs could be denied firearms under any gun control system is patently silly. Psychotic mass murderers have repeatedly bought guns in states with waiting periods.

The most effective way to deal with criminal possessing guns is to better enforce laws regarding criminal gun acquisition and to target the black market that supplies the gigantic majority of criminal guns.

The National Institute of Justice has several well thought-out possibilities to directly attack the black market and none interferes with constitutional rights. Now, all they need is the knotholes in Congress to listen.

Expansion is better alternative — I have been following the school bond election quite closely and find it interesting how the Twin Falls School Board has completely reversed its position since the first proposal of a ninth grade center.

The board was completely against the expansion of the current high school because it would create a "mega school" and too many students would "get lost in the crowd" and "slip between the cracks."

Now, with the proposal of a completely new school, the mega school system is OK. Who is correct on the projection of the growth of our community? The school board, who is trying to sell a \$20 million bond, projects a growth of 206 students by 1993, or the state, which projects a decline of 276 students by 1993? Maybe we should choose a happy medium and use a 0 percent growth figure.

Using figures presented in the first proposal and quotes from the paper, there seems to be a much less expensive way to achieve the goals we are after by using the existing high school.

By expanding the current high school, we can also avoid the need for a completely new administrative staff at a cost of \$200,000 or more per year which would be required at the new high school.

I don't think Gooding County, nor the State Parks Department, is going to sit and do nothing. There's rumors out there that the spawning area is already being dredging in Crystal Lake and all they're talking about dredging is the upper pool from the point where the hatchery water enters the stream north to the toe of the lower falls.

The suspended solids and nutrients from the hatchery has caused sediment to build up in the stream bed and along the edge of the banks. It's allowed a buildup of sedi-

ment where the nutrients have fed cattails and other plants. The exact situation that was at Crystal.

"There is just no chance that this is going to lose," Ron Rankin, president of the Idaho Property Owners Association, told a fundraising dinner.

The Tuesday-night event was attended by about 200 people, and featured a speech by former state legislator and governor candidate Rachel Gilbert of Boise. "The arrogant Legislature has refused to listen to the people," Gilbert said.

Police say speed caused truck to flip

IDAHO FALLS — An Idaho State Police investigation has found that excessive speed probably caused an Air Force transport truck carrying a Minuteman II missile to flip on its side two weeks ago as it left Interstate 15 for an eastern Idaho weigh station.

The civilian driver, Barry Hatch, 35, of Salt Lake City, has been cited for driving too fast for conditions, authorities said.

According to the police report, investigators found no evidence of pre-accident mechanical malfunctions that would have caused the truck to overturn on April 18, closing the interstate for extended periods on three straight days.

Consulting company wins contract

POCAHELLO — Capital Industries, a Boise-based consulting company owned by former U.S. Senate candidate Ron Wiegler, tentatively has won an Idaho State University contract for a feasibility study on a new cancer treatment program.

The feasibility study is on the Boron Neutron Capture Therapy program, which has been under study at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

Lawyers' group cancels convention

COEUR D'ALENE — A Washington state lawyers' group has voted to cancel plans for a 1992 conference in the Idaho Panhandle, in part because of the proximity of a new hotel compound.

The Young Lawyers Division of the Washington State Bar Association had planned to hold next year's mid-year meeting at the Coeur d'Alene Resort, 30 miles east of Spokane, Wash., in April 1992.

The plans were canceled in part due to the proximity of the white supermodern Arvon Nations compound at Hayden Lake, just north of here.

Court doesn't agree man was 'coerced'

BOISE — The Idaho Court of Appeals isn't buying an appeal from a prison inmate that his sentence should be thrown out because he was "coerced" into pleading guilty to save his girlfriend from the stress of a life sentence.

The court on Thursday rejected a petition for post-conviction relief from Kevin Amerson, sentenced from Kootenai County for scaling a \$1,200 watch and burglary.

Amerson's appeal said he pleaded guilty because would have had to testify at his trial, and he wanted to save her that stress.

Tribe accuses state of mismanagement

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — The two tribal officials, Idaho Land state and federal governments have "spoken with a forked tongue" about ownership of Lake Coeur d'Alene for over a century, says the attorney for the U.S. Department of Interior. "Stensgar cited 'abuse by the state of Idaho of its trusteeship of Lake Coeur d'Alene' as the primary reason behind the tribe's ownership claim."

But state Auditor J.D. Williams, representing the Land Board, said the state has claimed ownership to all its navigable waters since statehood. He cited an "equal footing" clause in the U.S. Constitution that released all waterways to the 13 original colonies in the 18th century. Other waterways not included in the original colonization were withheld from Indian ownership pending statehood, said Williams, an attorney.

And Ernie Stensgar, tribal chairman, said at a public meeting on the issue Wednesday that the state has forfeited its claim to the lake by allowing the once-pristine waters to become polluted with industrial waste.

About 250 people, including some members of the white-supremacist Church of Jesus Christ, Christian-Arvon Nation from nearby Hayden Lake, turned out for the meeting.

Symms presses challenge for events with Stallings

NAMPA (AP) — Republican U.S. Sen. Steve Symms renewed his challenge to likely Democratic Senate candidate Richard Stallings for immediate joint appearances on Thursday despite his continuing evasiveness over whether he will seek a third year in office.

During an appearance in Canyon County to honor various civic groups, Symms urged those organizations to honor him to speak at their functions to also invite the four-term congressman for the same event.

Then, Symms said, "we can discuss our different views on how to address the serious issues of the day."

Last week, Stallings announced formation of an exploratory committee with the intention of seeking the U.S. Senate seat held by Symms in 1992.

Stallings was silent for 24 hours and then challenged Stallings to immediately join him in a marathon of joint appearances to debate the issues. But the conservative senator also surprised reporters by repeatedly hedging his responses about his future political plans and forcing state GOP leaders to consider the possibility that he might retire.

Whenever his decision, however, Symms has vowed to play a major role in the 1992 campaign.

Stallings said he did not expect to begin his formal campaign until the end of the year, and he contended it was premature to talk about joint appearances with Symms when the incumbent has yet to decide whether he will run in 1992.





Conservation grant targets Magic Valley wetlands area

WASHINGTON — Idaho will receive a grant of \$125,000 to preserve and protect a Magic Valley wetlands area.

Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan announced the grant for the Thousand Springs-Chilly Slough area. It's part of \$8 million in grants for threatened wetlands in the United States, Canada and Mexico under the North American Wetlands Conservation Act.

Lujan said the money is for acquisition and enhancement of wetland habitat for migratory birds and other fish and wildlife.

The largest grant was \$675,000 for acquisition of key parcels around the 12,600-acre Swan Lake Area Wildlife project in Minnesota.

Hazleton resident arrested, charged with raping girl

JEROME — A 39-year-old Hazleton man has been arrested and charged with raping a girl under the age of 18.

Michael G. Wamengo remained in the Jerome County jail Thursday evening after Sun District Magistrate Roger Burdick set bail at \$27,000.

Wamengo was arrested Wednesday after a girl reported earlier in the day that she had been raped, Jerome County Sheriff Larry Gold said.

A public defender was appointed to represent Wamengo at a preliminary hearing will be held within two weeks if he remains in custody.

Funding fight threatens Idaho highways

WASHINGTON — Though Idaho has more than 4,935 miles of major state highways, it has less money available to care for those roads than all but five other states, government figures show.

And the state's highway-funding headache may grow more painful. The federal highway-funding program expires on Sept. 30, and fighting over how much each state gets to and takes from the \$13 billion-a-year federal highway fund is becoming increasingly frenzied on Capitol Hill.

States like Idaho are caught in an unenviable double bind when it comes to highway funding, since relatively few taxpayers are available to foot the bill for mammoth stretches of highways, said William D. Wilches. He is executive director of the Washington-based Road Information Project, a non-profit research group funded by the construction industry and labor groups.

The group this week released a half-year study of the highway-funding needs of each state.

Popular sources of highway funding such as gasoline taxes don't generate much

revenue in a sparsely populated state like Idaho, he said, because there are fewer people buying gas.

Idaho's 18-cent-a-gallon fuel tax rate falls in with the fuel-tax rate in most of the other 50 states, but the revenue generated by that tax — \$81.1 million in 1990 — was the ninth-lowest in the nation.

In 1990, Idaho received 51.8 percent of its \$226.6 million highway budget from the federal government. The balance came largely from motor-fuel taxes.

At more than 51.8 percent, Idaho depends more on federal funding for its highways than all but five other states.

At least three major transportation bills have been introduced in Congress to dictate which state will get what over the next five years. Lobbying groups are eagerly supplying reporters and congressional staffers with reports to illustrate how unfair — or perfectly equitable — the system of the last nine years has been.

Mortality rates above expectation in area facilities

TWIN FALLS — Magic Valley hospital administrators reacted angrily Thursday to a federal report that said five south-central Idaho acute-care facilities have higher-than-expected mortality rates among Medicare patients.

"It's basically a number of context," said Gail Goglia, administrator of the Blaine County Medical Center in Hailey.

"It's just another government waste of time," said Randy Holom, administrator of Mindoka Memorial Hospital in Rupert.

and Blaine County all had lower-than-expected mortality rates among Medicare patients.

The report's conclusions were based upon the deaths of Medicare patients within 180 days of being admitted. Medicare is the federal health care insurance program for the disabled and those over 65.

According to HCFA, the mortality rates at all 44 acute-care hospitals in Idaho were within or below predicted levels.

The rates in the agency's report are "not necessarily representative of a hospital's total performance in all aspects of patient care," said HCFA Administrator Gail Wilensky.

"The numbers are 'alarming to the public' but don't offer any real indication of a hospital's quality, said Goglia.

Because of the relatively low number of Medicare patients, Blaine County's mortality rate was below predicted levels.

Cafeteria remodeling, gym floor top Buhl's summer list

BUHL — Elementary kids will eat in a remodeled cafeteria next year and middle school students will bounce their basketballs on a new gym floor.

Bids have been accepted for the two Buhl School District projects, though both were higher than expected.

The cost for the cafeteria remodeling originally was estimated at \$24,000. The total cost for this project is now at \$31,468.

A local contractor, Hayes Construction, will do the work for \$13,000, including all plumbing, electrical and construction work. H.S. & R. will supply all the equipment for \$18,468.

Both contracts stipulate that the project will be completed by July 15.

The middle school gym floor has been in need of repair for some time and has numerous "dead spots."

Originally it was estimated the project would cost about \$56,000. The bid accepted at Tuesday evening's School Board meeting came in at \$59,924 from Hicks Brothers Wood Floors.

Hicks Brothers figured the job two ways, both including laying the new floor over the existing old floor. One plan would lay the floor down over felt and perpendicular to the old floor. The other plan calls for a plywood base, felt, and then the new floor laid parallel over the existing floor.

Construction is expected to begin about the middle of June and take up to six weeks to complete.

The board said it wants the plywood and felt plan, laying the wood parallel with the old gym floor. The board also said that the job would be complete by August 20 so the gym will be finished before school begins in the fall.

"The board adopted budget revisions presented by Superintendent Gene Pyles. The revisions were necessary due to the enrollment of more students than anticipated and due to salary increases for teachers," Pyles said cuts were made in many areas of the budget, but textbooks and educational teaching supplies weren't cut back.

The school district approved a contract for Kris Muldoon, a speech therapist for the 1991-92 school year. Superintendent Pyles said Muldoon will be involved in screening children before school begins and said this will be a big benefit to the district.

The board gave its approval for membership in the Region IV Tech-Prep Consortium — a group of school districts that have joined together to offer vocational education. An additional partner will be hired as a recruitment and inservice specialist.

Other school districts in this membership include Murfreesboro, Hansen and Castledale. Superintendent Pyles will be the chairman of this consortium.

Three foreign exchange students were accepted for the 1991-92 school year. These students are from Germany, the Netherlands, and Japan.

Contract rift tearing N. Idaho consolidated district in apart

PLUMMER (AP) — The first school-district consolidation in Idaho in four decades is being undermined by teacher contract negotiations to merge the pay and benefit plans of the old Plummer and Worley school districts.

"There is a problem, and we weren't prepared for it," admitted Jean Kerfu, a former Plummer justice who now serves on the board of the consolidated district. "This whole process is tearing us apart."

The teachers from the two districts have been worked under their 1989-90 contracts through the first year of consolidation while negotiations were under way. Negotiations a special consolidation committee predicted, would create no problems.

The bargaining broke down this week when the teachers rejected a compromise contract offer that reflected the difficulty in quickly merging differing economic histories. The pact failed to unify wages and benefits for all teachers.

The teachers have worked hard to blend both districts, Idaho Education Association spokeswoman Peggy Park said. "Frankly, they

were stunned to receive a proposal that maintained that separateness."

First, there was debate over exactly what issues were subject to negotiation. Worley teachers had a voice in teaching conditions and terms of employment. Plummer teachers bargained only on salaries and benefits.

Then there were the specifics of the economic packages. Worley teachers had a lower starting salary, but higher annual raises and their benefit package was more generous.

Ada County asks court to order inmate removal

BOISE (AP) — Ada County officials have launched another attempt to get the state prison system to pick up its prisoners from the county jail.

Commissioners filed a motion in 4th District Court Wednesday asking a judge to require state prison officials to explain why they have not complied with an earlier court order to remove state prisoners from the jail.

"We have tried to be reasonable with state prison officials, but there comes a time when we have to be forceful in defending the interests of Ada County taxpayers," Commissioner Gary Glenn said.

"We recognize the state prison system has crowding problems, but they have other facilities. They have more options," Glenn said. "We're simply calling on state officials to abide by a lawful court order."

In June, 4th District Judge ordered the Department of Corrections to take its state-sentenced prisoners from the Ada County jail within seven days of notification by the sheriff. At the time, more than 100 state-sentenced prisoners were in the jail, many of them for months.

Overcrowding is at the center of both the county's wish to clear out state prisoners and the state's tardiness in picking them up.

For years, Corrections has leaned on jails to absorb its prisoner backlog, unable to build cells fast enough to stay ahead of the rising tide of convicted felons.

"I'm not overreacting in the Ada County Jail a crisis," commissioners said they are hard-pressed to find room for their own prisoners.

Yellowstone weighs options for bison trouble

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK Wyo. (AP) — Yellowstone National Park officials, having failed repeatedly to keep diseased bison from heading into Montana, are considering a proposal to replace the park's bison with healthy animals.

Aimed at eradicating brucellosis, a disease that can cause cattle to abort their unborn calves and undulant fever in humans, the proposal is one of five alternatives being considered by officials drafting a bison management plan.

The evolving management plan is seen by officials as necessary both to stem the possible transmission of brucellosis as well as to halt property damage bison cause in Montana.

Over the years park officials have tried rubber bullets, canned wolf howls and fences to keep bison out of Montana. But the unruly animals, which have been known to plod through barbed-wire fences, have nevertheless headed into Montana whenever heavy snows

have prompted them to look elsewhere for forage.

In late 1989 officials from Yellowstone, the Gallatin National Forest, and the Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks agency set out to produce a management plan that would stop the bison.

The five alternatives now being circulated for public comment include options to let the bison roam wherever they want to establishing bison management areas outside of Yellowstone.

Two other options call for stopping bison from leaving the park by either intercepting them at the borders or somewhere further inside the park.

The fifth alternative calls for a brucellosis-free bison herd that could be achieved through the slaughter of infected animals, with female calves vaccinated yearly, or replacement of all of Yellowstone's estimated 3,000 bison.

"An experimental approach could include embryo transplant to establish a brucella-free nuclear,"

the fifth alternative said. "Another approach... would be the removal of all park bison and the reintroduction of brucella-free animals."

Each of the alternatives contains a provision for shooting bison that pose a nuisance beyond Yellowstone's borders.

During the winter of 1987-88 Montana officials, concerned about the possible spread of brucellosis, allowed a hunt of bison that led to the killing of nearly 600 of the shaggy beasts.

Write the hunt minimized the brucellosis threat, it also led to a public relations nightmare for Montana. Last month Gov. Stan Stephens signed legislation ending the controversial hunt.

"It was unfortunate that Mon-

tanans were portrayed as being more interested in simply shooting buffalo than they were in addressing a serious disease problem," Stephens said at the time.

Public comment on the five alternatives is scheduled to continue through May 24, with an alternative action plan drafted later in the year. An environmental impact statement on the draft management plan is scheduled to be written during the first half of 1992, with a final plan adopted by early 1993.

The final plan is aimed at protecting livestock from brucellosis, reducing human conflicts and property damage, and maintaining a free-ranging, self-sustaining bison herd in Yellowstone.

Search-Finders sponsors attempt to open records

BOISE (AP) — In June 1969, Pamela Burrows gave birth to a baby girl at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center in Boise.

Without a job or a home, Burrows gave her daughter up for adoption, hoping to give the child a better life.

"I didn't think I had any alternative," said Burrows now 41. "I've always cared about her over the years. It never leaves your mind."

Burrows and about 15 other birth parents and adoptive children filed papers Wednesday seeking information to help them trace their relatives.

The occasion was the second annual "Open My Records" Day, sponsored by the American Adoption Congress in an effort to increase access to adoption records nationwide.

The Boise observance was sponsored by Search-Finders of Idaho Inc., a non-profit organization that helps birth parents find their children and adoptive children find their birth parents.

Joni Burrows of Eagle, who recently located her parents after appearing on NBC's "Unsolved Mysteries," said she would have preferred to go the court-record route.

She went on television because her son J.J. was suffering upon 40 seizures a day, and she didn't know why. Graves hoped her genetic history might yield some clues.

As a result of the broadcast, both her parents were identified. Both are willing to submit to genetic testing, she said.

In Idaho, original birth certificates are sealed at the time of adoption and cannot be unsealed without court orders.

Change might be on the way, Search-Finders spokesman Joyce Krummes said. A task force recently appointed by Richard Donovan, director of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, is studying adoption issues in Idaho.

Roseanne Hardin, deputy attorney general for Health and Welfare, is task force chairwoman.

While Idaho is unlikely to soon follow the lead of Alaska and Kansas, which automatically open records to adoptees 18 or older, Hardin said the task force might endorse more moderate change.

One possibility is to allow records to be opened if birth parents and adoptive parents both agree to it at the time of the adoption.

Interest rates fell in the credit markets Thursday

on the heels of reductions over the past two days in the Federal Reserve's discount rate and the prime lending rate at many large banks across the country.

Prices of long-term government bonds rose about \$3 for each \$1,000 in face value, lowering their yields to the 8.11 percent-8.15 percent range.
As rates came down, they reduce the relative attraction of interest-bearing investments that compete with stocks for investors' favor.


"Any fool who could take a fiancée should have made the game," confessed an unhappy South. "You had Lida's love the next to do so."
 Look over the play to see if you agree with South's self-condemnation.
 South refused the first heart, won the second and lost a diamond-finesse. East cleared the hearts and South cashed the diamonds, discarding a club. (West discarded two spades and a heart.) The club queen was led from dummy, but when East failed to cover, South went up with the ace. A second club was led to dummy but East refused this trick. West discarding a heart. East then took the third club, cashed a diamond and exited in spades. West's guarded spade king took the setting trick.
 Was South's mistake his refusing the club finesse? Actually he made the right play, given the bidding. West surely had a six-card heart suit, and South could not afford to lose to a singleton king of clubs (5-6-11 distribution for West). The mistake was not the play of the club ace but the discard of a club on the fourth diamond. (For that matter, why cash the fourth diamond?) Had South held on to the fourth club and discarded a spade instead, dummy's fourth club would not have been stranded, and declarer would have made an easy nine tricks.



HOLLYWOOD - Will "Terminator 2" really be the most expensive movie in history, topping out at as much as \$110 million? TWIN FALLS - Starry-eyed kids from around the Magic Valley tried out earlier this week for the Missoula Children's Theatre production of "Hansel and Gretel."

And they're now ready to perform the updated version of the classic "Cinderella" tale with only a week's worth of rehearsals.

About 150 budding actors and actresses turned out at the auditions last Monday in hopes of filling the roles of "Cooks, Gingerbread People, Greasy Grannies, Waltons" and, of course, Hansel and Gretel. Four student directors and 58 actors and actresses will participate in the production.

Kam James, 11, who attends Sawtooth Elementary School, will play Gretel and Brent Weston, 12, who attends Perrine Elementary School, will play Hansel.

"It's fun. All we had to do was a little dance step," said Johanna Herrett, a 13-year-old who attends Sawtooth Elementary. "I like to act."

Laura Donahue and T.J. Charlson, the residency directors, say they try to make the auditions fun for the kids because they don't feel it should be a stressful experience for them. Donahue and Charlson choose their rising stars if they can follow directions, are excited about the program, are happy and dynamic and want to be there. But they also look for the children who will benefit the most from being in a production.

"The kids are put to the test by saying their names and ages, and loud, making different faces and dancing a little bit," said Yohan Folkinga, an 8-year-old who attends Popplewell Elementary. Eight-year-old Joseph Brumbaek, who attends St. Edwards, said the lyrics were "sort of OK." He said he liked the scary faces they made.

"I've been in acting a lot. I've taken drama a lot," said Yvonne Wade, a 13-year-old who attends Robert Smith Junior High School. "Taking a different role this time around as a production assistant."

Donahue and Charlson said the pace the kids keep during their week-of-rehearsals is exhausting, but the kids enjoy it.

"They don't know we're putting a show on so fast. They don't get bored," Donahue said. "The residency team is on a fast pace as well. Donahue and Charlson begin their week each Monday in a new town holding auditions. Rehearsals begin about a half an hour after the auditions end. The kids practice from 4-6 p.m. and again from 6:30-8:30 p.m. every day until Saturday, the big performance day."

Donahue and Charlson are traveling through Idaho, Oregon, Colorado, Wyoming, Montana and New Mexico to produce "Hansel and Gretel." Donahue, who holds a master's of fine arts in acting, and Charlson, who holds a master's of fine arts in directing, say they enjoy being a Missoula Children's Theatre team because they get to travel around and see many places. They also enjoy working with a new cast each week and they say it doesn't get boring because they sometimes change parts of the play. The play, itself, isn't the traditional


The variety show is being staged to raise money for Guardian ad Litem, a volunteer group that helps ease children's participation in courtroom proceedings.

Actors recall favorite scenes as 'Dallas' bids adieu

HOLLYWOOD - J.R. Ewing, who for 13 years couldn't "Dallas" never met a man he couldn't double-cross or a woman he couldn't bed, has finally met his match: the power that be at CBS, who has decided to send the Texas oilman to its final round.

The 35th and final show, a two-hour send-off, in "It's a Wonderful Life" fashion, depicts how the "Dallas" world would have been without J.R. Ewing. The assignment, however, has been a boon for "Dallas," a best known for its 1980 cliffhanger, "Who Shot J.R.?" But which of the scores of storylines do the actors and producers recall most fondly? Last week, in phone interviews, several past and present cast members - though not

J.R.'s alter ego, Larry Hagman, who was incommunicado on vacation in Europe, and longtime executive producer Leonard Katzman, offered their own favorite memories of the show, which debuted April 2, 1978.

It was Katzman who conceived the idea of a season-ending cliffhanger, based on his youthful experience as an assistant director on movie serials. Along with the shooting of J.R.'s favorite remains "the return of the son," supposedly lead Bobby in the shower, at the end of the 1985-86 season, and the subsequent declaration that that entire season had merely been a dream of Pam.

"Regardless of the critical reaction, I will go to a grave believing that was the only way to bring Bobby back," he said. "I served a variety of purposes. It got people talking about the show over the summer, ended the competition between us and 'Miami Vice' in the first show of the new season, and allowed us to get rid of storylines we were not happy with."

For his part, the man who took that shower, Patrick Duffy, said that while he loved that plot, it was the earlier seasons that he most enjoyed.

"I think the storylines that were started and developed in the first seven years were the nicest and most valid," he said. "When they focused on the family - Ray Krebs becoming a (Ewing) brother (1980-81), losing Daddy in South America (1981-82). As we started to lose cast members and bring in new people, the show got watered down. It was the family that people were interested in, not that we were involved in international intrigue, but that we couldn't keep a family together."

Duffy's erstwhile screen sister-in-law, Lin

da Gray, was a series regular for 11 years and returned for Friday's final episode.

"I loved the season," played an alcoholic (1985-86), because as an actress I got to blow stuff about. I got a lot of cheerleader letters from people who said what they'd gone through and survived."

It was Sue Ellen's younger sister, Kristin Shepard, who proved to be the mystery character who shot J.R. "I'll be a trivia question. Please see DALLAS/D2

'Toy Soldiers' - male bonding gone bonkers

HOLLYWOOD. — "Toy Soldiers" takes place on a tree-lined Blue Ridge Mountain, Virginia, prep school, an upscale academy in excelsis. It's about brave rebel-preppies: a quintet of misbehaving rich kids who band together to fight Colombian cocaine cartel thugs who have taken over their campus.

As an idea for a movie, this ranks high among the most unpromising and ludicrous of the last several years. Writer-director Daniel Petrie, Jr., who had a sense of humor when he co-wrote "Beverly Hills Cop," seems to have lost it completely here. In the press information, he actually describes "Toy Soldiers" as "a film about the triumph of the spirit of teenage American boys under adversity." Really? Is "triumph of the spirit" just another marketing catch phrase now, like "fish out of water" or "boy meets girl"? Calling a plot like this about preppie misfits "defeating the drug underworld with modern games and firing guns" spiritually triumphant is like dreaming up an "inspiring" saga about an intrapid team of Doberman Pinschers who climb Mount Everest to battle a subterranean full of invading Martians. How can

we are uplifted by something we can't take seriously for a second? "Toy Soldiers" has been fashioned by Petrie and co-writer David Koepf ("Apartment Zero") into a teen male bonding comedy gone bonkers. It is set at Regis, supposedly notorious as the "Animal House" of American prep schools, with so many washouts

on its roster that its secret name is "Rejects." For some curious reason, Regis has hired Deobhai Elliot as its headmaster and Louis Gossett Jr. as its dean. In the movie, Gossett is Mr. Tough Love, and Elliot seems to symbolize impotent old liberalism, dithering about Franklin Roosevelt while the thugs push everybody around.

Material like this might have worked if the movie makers had played it completely crazy and over-the-top, if they had made it a true satire of the American upper class facing its worst nightmare.

But the tone of "Toy Soldiers" suggests that its makers might have tried to turn "Animal House" into a "triumph" of the same story. Sonorous music crashes with star-spangled fury.

The villains are presented as Latin American and blonde Nazi scum; maybe the two blacks in the cast (Gossett and T.E. Russell) are around to forestall racial objections.

"Toy Soldiers" is a wish fulfillment movie, but whose wishes is it fulfilling? Is it Star-Trying to tap the vast latent prep school audience? Play out some president preppie Persian Gulf allegory?

Are we meant to see George Bush lurking behind Sean Astin, Will Wheaton and Keith Coogan? I could never figure out what was supposed to be entertaining me in "Toy Soldiers" (MPAA rated R, for violence and language). But maybe the very idea that someone would make a movie like this is satire enough.

Simon falls in 'Marrying Man'

THE MARRYING MAN (R) — A man who remarries his wife four times is a man worth making a movie about, but this isn't the movie. Neil Simon's script is all promise and no deliver, and that goes double for Alec Baldwin and Kim Basinger, who lack the required chemistry to make their crazy lust believable.

THE SILENCE OF THE LAMBS (R) — Thomas Harris' harrowing, mesmerizing book concerned an institutionalized psychopath who is used to identify a rampaging serial killer. In a fine adaptation, director Jonathan Demme and screenwriter Ted Tally have focused on a duel of wits and wills between Jodie Foster's young FBI trainee and that paradigm of evil, Dr. Hannibal Lecter (Anthony Hopkins). Hopkins is glittering in the shower role, but Foster carries the film, suggesting the strength, gravity, intelligence, and compassion of Clancee Starling. For audiences, the fascination is how much both actors are able to do with their literally or

occupationally straitjacketed characters. Although Demme does not dwell on the gore, it's definitely there, making it a film not for the faint of heart.

TRENCH MUTANT NINJA TURTLES II: THE SECRET OF THE OOZE (PG) — Not quite awesome. This sequel to last year's surprise hit, derived from the popular comic and gussied up with hurtling, bodacious turtle puppets from the late Jim Henson's Creature Shop, soft-peddles the first movie's MTV glitz and pop violence in favor of some what more character and humor. It's still primarily for children and, except for its heroes, mostly unsurprising.

HOME ALONE (PG) — A 7-year-old child (Macaulay Culkin) is left behind by his parents when they jet to Paris for Christmas. Left to his own devices, he pigs out on junk food and foils a pair of bumbling thieves (Joe Pesci and Daniel Stern). Some of the low-comedic slapstick works out a little better than the rest. This level, but the best idea — an abandoned child — defending himself against intruders — is a bit too seamy for comfort. Chris Columbus directed from a script by — who else? — John Hughes.

Movie studios upset over curbs on trailers

LOS ANGELES—Miramax Films has had more than its share of run-ins with the Motion Picture Association of America ratings board (over such foreign pick-ups as "Tie Me Up, Tie Me Down"), but at least no one granted over the company's trailers or previews of coming attractions. Until now.
 Miramax's original teasers for "A Rage in Harlem" (opening today) and "Madonna: Truth or Dare" (May 10) went too far, charged the MPAA, which slapped both previews with a "red ban" or restricted rating. This meant the "Rage" trailer, which showed star Gregory Hines threatening a drunk with a gun, could only be shown with R-rated features.
 The original preview for Madonna's "Madonna: Truth or Dare" at the San Francisco International Film Festival Thursday, fared worse: It was threatened with an NC-17 and then an R, meaning it could only lead into R-rated or NC-17 features, such as "Henry & June." "I've done a study of how many R-rated movies are out there, but I can tell you there aren't many rated NC-17," said Miramax marketing executive Russell Schwartz.

"Those ratings certainly limit our chances of reaching an audience," Miramax ended up cutting the offending footage from the "Rage" preview, thus allowing it to be shown with "green band" or PG-rated movies.
 It submitted four versions of the Madonna trailer, none of which placated the ratings people.
 But nothing satisfied them. So we just said, 'Enough is enough. We'll go out with an R-rated trailer and hope for the best.'
 Yes, Madonna had a hand in the trailer. "She will look at everything concerning her films," Schwartz confirmed. On-screen, the singer even bits the ratings people. "Do we want to be accepted by Hollywood?" she leads her singers and dancers in a sort of backstage pep rally. "Do we want to have an R rating or an R rating?"
 The rousing answers: "No!" and "X!" Madonna and company succeed with a cinema-verite look at the "Ambition" world tour that pushes the envelope of above-ground-film-making while ridiculing those in the superstar's wake—from Detroit family members to Kevin Costner-to-Illenbeau Warren Beatty (who asked that he be cut out of the candid backstage scenes).

Williams gets shot at class, professional character in new CBS suspense drama

Victims of unhappy love affairs are popular fodder for TV movies. The latest unhappy people are to be found in "Victim of Love" (airing Sunday, May 5, on CBS), which stars JoBeth Williams, Pierce Brosnan and Virginia Madsen. It focuses on a therapist who has embarked on an affair with a university professor. Then she discovers that he seems to be the same man described by one of her patients as the cause of many of her problems.

"When I was reading the script, I found myself on the edge of my seat until the very last moment," says Williams, who plays therapist Tess Parker. "And that's rare for a TV movie. The script really held me."

Williams says that she was also drawn to the type of role the movie allowed her to play. "Lately, especially on TV, I've played a lot of earthy women," she muses. "All these noble, supportive mothers. (Williams has appeared in such TV movies as "The Day After" and "Adam.") I liked the fact that this woman was single, and though she's a therapist, she has a lot of style. She's very glamorous. I also liked the fact that she becomes vulnerable."

"It's a leap of faith when you begin a relationship," she continues. "You've got to decide whether to trust someone. In this case, her trust gets questioned. It's an interesting dilemma that we've all been through to some extent. How far do you trust someone?"

"You go from belief to disbelief and back to belief," she says of the plot. "People should really watch it all the way through. They shouldn't reach a point where they think the movie is over and just leave, because it isn't. There are surprises and changes right up until the last minute."

"It wasn't just the issue of trust that Williams found interesting; however, it was the chance to play a therapist. "I wanted to be a psychology major at Brown (University),"

she explains. "But I was dragged kicking and screaming into the theater department. I had done some acting in high school, but no one takes you seriously when you say you want to be an actress, so I dropped that idea and didn't talk about it anymore. I guess they found out in college I had done some acting, and they convinced me to try out for some plays, and then I got hooked all over again. That was it."

Although Williams says she enjoyed working on the movie, she admits that it went by so quickly that she doesn't even remember parts of it very well. "When you do a TV movie it goes so fast," she says. "We were on a 20-day shooting schedule, and we finished a day early. There were some days when you found yourself looking at each other and saying, 'What did we just do?'"

Ahead for Williams are an "outrageous" role in the Blake Edwards theatrical film "Switch" and a role opposite Ed O'Neill of "Married ... With Children" in "Dutch." But what Williams sounds most excited about is even more offbeat.

"I just finished doing the voice of a fish named Angelfish in a (forthcoming) nighttime (animated) series called "Fish Police," she says happily. "She's kind of the Jessica Rabbit (from "Who Framed Roger Rabbit") of the fish world."

Soap opera scene

Michael Sabatino: So bad he's good

In the world of soap a strange custom prevails: writers often wait for a new actor to tell them what to do with the character, not the other way around. Fans also signal a character's direction, that is thumbs up, or thumbs down.

This is a partial explanation for the actions of Michael Sabatino's Lawrence Alamain, a murderer and the rapist of Jennifer on "Days of Our Lives." When young Sabatino debuted as Lawrence last September, he was supposed to play a short-lived villain who must be punished for such dastardly acts.

It's May now, and Lawrence is still around. In fact he's returning to his homeland, Ubiand (a version of Malibu spelled backwards), with Kimberly in tow. To actor Sabatino's surprise, Lawrence has caught on with fans. So writers make him less a rat, and more of a good fellow. Still ahead lies plausible explanations for murder and rape. Such as trauma and medication, which changes behavior. That will take some doing.

The point is Lawrence has struck a chord with viewers. The nail for a rapist shouldn't be positive, but it is. Sabatino has only received two negative letters. That wasn't the original intention of creating Lawrence Alamain.

With such a dramatic plotting shift we may yet see Lawrence working with the homeless, rectifying past evil deeds. The tiger has changed his stripes.

Michael Sabatino admits he's working a thin line this spring, slowly easing off the nasty stuff. Nine years ago Sabatino broke into prime time soap on "Knots Landing" as Chip Roberts, murderer of Lisa Hartman's Ciji. Chip was punished in dramatic fashion — falling on a pitchfork. That isn't going to recocur with Lawrence, unless mail turns against the man.

Sabatino's villainous stint on "Knots Landing" proved to be an education. Michael could watch Julie Harris at work. "Julie made it all seem so simple, so delightful," says Sabatino. "There I was a beginner, and Miss Harris treated me as

an equal. I lived in Culver City at the time, and walked a mile and a half to MGM where "Knots" was made. Often, Julie would drive me home in her big old station wagon.

Remembering the Harris simper, Michael has learned to sit still in front of a camera. "I've always been afraid to do that. But it works with Lawrence."

Asked to explain the success of "Knots Landing," Michael offers a clue. "Fans think 'Knots' is their private little soap opera. It is a kitchen drama, everything takes place in somebody's kitchen, a big switch from the other prime-time soaps. People like that atmosphere."

A Californian who grew up hiking in the Santa Monica mountains when he wasn't sailing through the air as a top-notch pole vaulter (17 1/2 ft.) Michael can be found in the

Sierras when he isn't working. The man knows how to live. No wonder fans want him around. Another case of adapting a character to an actor.

Playing Robert Scorpio's brother Mac in "General Hospital" is Tom York. Before focusing on acting, John was going into marketing, studying at the University of Whitewater in Wisconsin. After two years in college, he started acting lessons back in Chicago and made his professional debut with the Wisdom Bridge Theatre. In 1983, John went to Hollywood and got parts in such series as "Murder, She Wrote" and "Hunter." He played Eric Gord in the series "Werewolf" for two seasons. A: The Grave Line Tours were started four years ago by Greg Smith, who felt people wanted to see the more macabre side of Hollywood and its legendary stars. The two-and-a-half-hour tour — in a 1986 Cadillac hearse — costing \$30 per person, features the deaths, sins, suicides and scandals of Hollywood. The drive chronicles the more interesting departures of more than 80 celebrities.

Q: Polo was very popular in the golden age of Hollywood when stars and producers used to gather at Will Rodgers' private polo field. Hasn't there been a revival of the megabucks sport in Hollywood?

Who are the stars in the saddle? P.B.

A: There has indeed been a revival of interest in the sport in recent years. At the forefront has been Sylvester Stallone, who may be one of the few Hollywood celebrities actually able to afford the costs involved, including owning the string of ponies and providing for their care. Other celebrity polo players include William Devane, Stefanie Powers, Doug Sheehan, Steve Bond and Jameson Parker, whose efforts are supported by corporate sponsors like Piaget watches as they frequently compete in charity matches.

'Twin Peaks' scene draws disfavor from British broadcasting group

LONDON (AP) — Britain's broadcasting watchdog agency has decided that "Twin Peaks," the cult soap opera, is in bad taste.

A murder on the surrealistic crime thriller went "beyond all acceptable limits," the Broadcasting Standards Council said Thursday in its first such finding since it was created in January.

The council was set up by Act of Parliament to consider allegations of bad taste and bad language on television. It has strong powers of moral persuasion but cannot actually get programs banned.

The offending scene was in an episode in which anti-heroine Laura Palmer's murderer was disclosed. Miss Palmer's cousin suffered several violent blows to her face and was hurled against a framed picture by the killer, who then slashed her face until it streamed with blood.

Eight viewers said the episode, broadcast by the British Broadcasting Corp. Feb. 19, con-

tained protracted and gratuitous violence.

The BBC told the standards council that series director David Lynch was a leading cultural figure in the United States, and defended the scene by saying "the series was not a naturalistic drama but had a somewhat surreal quality."

Also, the BBC argued, "Twin Peaks" airs after 9 p.m., when the prime hours for family viewing are over.

The council dismissed the BBC complaint, pointing to a section of the council charter that states:

"The degradation of women, as objects of male violence, should be handled with particular sensitivity, requiring the details of an attack to be given sparingly."

"I find it rather sad," said William Peck of World Vision Enterprises, which distributes "Twin Peaks."

"This is the only country that we have had a complaint about 'Twin Peaks.' Indeed, everyone has thought it one of the most wonderful and engaging and mystical series they've seen," Peck said.

The program is televised throughout western Europe, and in Poland and Yugoslavia. Deals are in the works to provide the show in Hungary and Czechoslovakia, Peck said.

NBC wins 1st week of May sweeps

LOS ANGELES (AP) — NBC won the first week of the May sweeps ratings contest with help from an unrelenting advertising campaign for its ripped-from-the-headlines miniseries "Switched at Birth."

Part one of a true-life story about two Florida couples whose newborns were accidentally switched in a hospital nursery was the most watched show on television last week, according to figures released

Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. NBC, which aired scores of radio and television ads trumpeting the program, also won the overall network ratings race with a 12.7 average. ABC was second with 11.4 and CBS was third with 11.1.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes. Last week marked the beginning of May sweeps, a monthlong period during which networks schedule blockbuster programming to boost ratings. Ratings during sweeps periods determine advertising rates for affiliate stations.

NBC's "Cheers" was No. 2 for the week, followed by CBS' Sunday news magazine "60 Minutes."

An episode showing series stars Susan Dey, Harry Hamlin and Jimmy Smits leaving the fold of "L.A.

Law" pushed the series into a two-way tie for fourth place with CBS' "Murder, She Wrote."

The trio from television's favorite yuppie-law firm had said they were leaving the show to pursue other projects. But Dey announced Tuesday she was returning next season. Whether or not Hamlin and Smits will return in guest appearances was not announced.

A rerun of ABC's hit comedy "Roseanne" was No. 6.

The premiere of ABC's "Dinosaurs" tied for seventh place with NBC's reality-based whodunit series "Unsolved Mysteries."

ABC's "America's Funniest Home Videos" was No. 9.

NBC's broadcast of "The 26th Annual Country Music Awards," featuring weepy performances by The Judds and Reba McEntire, and ABC's "Family Matters" tied for 10th place.

ABC and Peter Jennings continued to dominate the network news race, finishing last week with a 9.5 average. NBC and Tom Brokaw were second with an 8 and CBS and Dan Rather were third with 7.9.

CBS, Turner discuss news alliance

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS Inc. and Turner Broadcasting System Inc. are discussing the possibility of an alliance between CBS and Turner's Cable News Network in gathering news, officials of both companies confirmed Monday.

The trade publication Electronic Media reported that top officials of both companies have agreed to meet in mid-May to discuss a possible agreement on sharing international and domestic news.

CBS News spokeswoman Donna

Dees said without elaboration that "CBS is exploring many options; CNN is just one possibility."

In Atlanta, CNN spokesman Steve Haworth said there are exploratory talks, but "there's certainly no specific agenda we would be able to discuss."

CBS has been looking for ways to cut costs in response to the slump in network advertising brought on by the recession. It recently announced plans to cut 400 jobs, including an estimated

100 in the news division; in an effort to save \$100 million a year.

In early 1990, CBS and Turner officials reportedly had discussions about how they might cooperate in gathering news overseas.

Ann Morrigen, a spokeswoman for CBS, said CBS has been meeting with CNN and other organizations over the past year to discuss news-gathering but that nothing has been decided.

"These are just exploratory talks," she said.






