Sanctions spur Iraqi discontent

The Associated Press BAGHDAD, Iraq — Iraqis struggling to rebuild lives shattered by the Persian Gulf War are becoming increasingly fed up with shortages and soaring inflation, and one diplomat said the situation could lead to unrest. Iraq's economy was severely damaged by the war, and things have steadily worsened since the fighting ended in February. In fact, trade sanctions imposed by the United Nations shortly after Iraq invaded Kuwait are starting to take a toll.

The sanctions are now beginning to bite," said Berni Bernander, the U.N. special representative in Baghdad. Iraq is allowed to import food and medicine under the sanctions. But until it can export its oil, it will have little cash to obtain reasonably priced supplies of basic necessities. Many of the goods coming into the country are being bought by private businessmen with hard currency they stockpiled before the war. They must in turn sell the goods at high prices to make a profit. "There's a general deterioration of the economic situation," said an ambassador from a Third World country, who spoke on condition of anonymity. He predicted that an additional six-months of sanctions would bring "internal disorder." "You can see the beginning of this widespread discontent," the ambassador said. President Bush has said the sanctions will remain as long as Saddam Hussein is in power. But nobody in Iraq sees an alternative to Saddam. In the meantime, government officials have told people to brace for the worst, and

merchants are battling for foreign food and other goods that they sell at grossly-inflated prices. Iraqis line up for rationed food and gasoline and try to make ends meet by taking on second jobs. Jader Saleh, a government clerk for 24 years, also drives a taxi these days. "I pay my salary for the rent, and without the taxi my family cannot eat meat or vegetables or wear shoes," he said. The official exchange rate for the Iraqi dinar is \$3.20. But on the street, it takes 3 to 6 dinars to buy one dollar.

Dogs biting often this year

Shelter impounds 23 animals over 6-week period

TWIN FALLS — Twenty-three local dogs have been quarantined during the past six weeks for biting people — an unusually high number when compared to the norm of about one dog a week. Laurie Simonds, with the local Humane Society chapter, said that about 85 percent of the bites have been (caused) by human error.

Occasionally, however, there are vicious dogs brought to the shelter who will bite anyone, Simonds said. For instance, a Labrador-retriever cross that had been quarantined at the shelter last summer was brought in again Wednesday after biting the face of a 5-year-old. It has since been killed.

She also said that some breeds are more likely to bite, such as the German shepherd breed commonly used for police dogs.

"German shepherds are by nature more protective and territorial," but it is up to the owner to train them properly, she said. Simonds recommends that people research the breed of dog they have selected as a pet, and then take obedience training classes to become more aware of their individual dog's nature.

As how to train them, and seconded Simonds' advice to take a dog to obedience training school. "Dogs seem to be less disciplined these days," Saras said. The city's animal control officer, Clay Vanderpool, said the owner is responsible for all costs incurred during quarantine. Vanderpool said that the number of dogs "is higher than usual," but could not contribute the high numbers to any specific cause. He did say a lack of owner supervision or control contributes to the problem and said that criminal charges can be brought against an owner whose dog bites someone if the dog is unrestrained. The maximum jail term is \$300 and/or 90 days in jail. Owners also can face civil charges. Please see BITE/A2

Americans give more to relief

The Associated Press WASHINGTON — Despite the recession, Americans are digging deeper into their pockets to give to the hungry both at home and abroad, representatives of relief organizations said Thursday. Some credited media coverage of disasters in Kurdistan, Bangladesh, Peru, Africa and elsewhere. "When Americans see a problem and a concern, they want to respond," said Kenneth H. Phillips, chairman of the American Council for Voluntary International Action. "The more problems in the world they are aware of, in fact the more they will respond," he said. "Quite frankly, it's all driven by media coverage," said John Mohrbacher, public relations manager for CARE. "As soon as attention really completely drops away from Bangladesh, we won't

'Antipyretic' settles spelling title duel

WASHINGTON — Joanne Lagatta, a 13-year-old from Clintonville, Wis., won the 64th National Spelling Bee Thursday. She correctly spelled "inappetence" and "antipyretic" to end 90 minutes of unabridged torture with her last competitor. Joanne bested Maria Mathew, 11, of Sterling, Ill., who slipped up with the mistaken spelling: "inappetence." "I was getting more and more nervous," Joanne said. "I just wanted to call it in." Joanne tensely bit her lip when she spelled "antipyretic," which means an agent that allays fever. She immediately went to the judge, Maria and shook her hand, then, with eyes and mouth wide open, breathlessly accepted a gilded trophy. "Asked why she was so confident-spelling the final word, she explained, "We just studied it in health class." Joanne also correctly spelled "inappetence," meaning a lack of desire for food or drink,

which Maria had misspelled. Joanne began the 25th round by correctly spelling "anxiolytic," which means a drug that relieves stress and worry. Two years ago, Joanne bowed out in the fourth round when she misspelled "apocryphal." She told reporters she did not study a dictionary or spelling lists to prepare for the contest, relying instead on her own reading habits and some coaching from her mother. "I read some books like over and over again," she said. "Whenever I see a new word, I just remember it."

Of the six spellers who were competing in their third national spelling bee, only one survived Thursday morning's session. He was Todd Erik Wallace, 13, from Blackfoot, Idaho, who correctly spelled "hookworm." Joanne, whose mother is a nurse and whose father is a hospital administrator, is in the eighth grade at Clintonville Junior High School. She plays fench hock in the band and is a member of the ski club.

Doubt cast on recovery forecast

WASHINGTON (AP) — Consumers, lacking any appreciable increase in incomes, cut back their spending 0.1 percent in April, the government said Thursday in a report that cast further doubt on anything better than a sluggish recovery from the recession.

Analysts said two other reports — a slight increase in new home sales in April for the third month in a row and a slim decline in new claims for unemployment benefits for the second straight week in mid-May — also suggested a slow turnaround in the economy this summer.

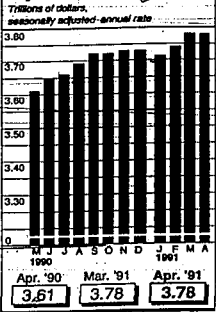
The Commerce Department said consumer spending, expected to be the engine driving the economy out of the recession, totaled a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$3.78 trillion in April. That was down from \$3.782 trillion in March and ended a two-month string of advances. Still, the revised 1.1 percent gain in March was stronger than the 0.6 percent advance first reported.

The department also said personal incomes, another key to recovery, rose just 0.1 percent to \$4.76 trillion at an annual rate, up from \$4.75 trillion a month earlier.

Despite the diminutive gain, it was the third consecutive advance in incomes. The department also revised the March increase to 0.4 percent, rather than the 0.2 percent in the original report.

 The department also said personal report. Consumers are expected to lead the economy out of recession, since their spending represents two-thirds of the nation's economic activity. But analysts said they are being restrained by high unemployment and interest rates and weak income growth and tight credit.
 Still, the Commerce Department

said in another report that sales of new homes rose 1.0 percent in April to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 500,000 units. It was the third monthly advance since sales plunged 10.8 percent to a 414,000 rate in January, the lowest level since the 1981-82 recession. Most other housing indicators also have improved since their January lows, leading analysts to suggest the housing recession hit bottom that month. But they are forecasting the recovery to be subdued.

In its report, the Labor Department said the number of Americans filing first-time unemployment claims fell by 9,000 during the week ending May 18, to 445,000, following a 5,000-drop the previous week.

The decline in personal consumption included a \$1.9 billion plunge in spending on durable goods items ranging from cars to computers expected to last more than three years. It tipped out much of a \$14.9 billion gain in March.

Spending on non-durable goods, including food and fuel, fell \$5.2 billion after rising just \$400 million a month earlier. Spending on services, which jumped \$25.9 billion in March, slowed to a \$12.9 billion gain in April.

On the other hand, disposable income — income after taxes — was unchanged in April after rising 0.4 percent in March and 0.3 percent a month earlier.

Court rules prosecutors can be sued

WASHINGTON (AP) — Prosecutors can be sued for the legal advice they give police and can be forced to pay damages when that advice leads to someone's rights being violated, the Supreme Court ruled Thursday.

The court unanimously revived an Indiana woman's lawsuit against a prosecutor who had advised police to have her hypnotized before she was questioned as a suspect in the shootings of her two sons.
 "Although the absence of absolute immunity for the act of giving legal advice may cause prosecutors to consider their advice more carefully, where an official could be expected to know that his conduct would violate statutory or constitutional rights, he should be made to hesitate," Justice Byron R. White wrote for the court.

In other decisions, the court: Made it easier in a case from Michigan, for non-union public employees to withhold from the unions that represent them in collective bargaining some of the fees they pay in their dues.

Ruled, by a 5-4 vote in a Virginia case, that a criminal defendant has no right to ask potential jurors about what specifics they heard or read about the case.

Ruled 6-3 in a California case that police don't need court warrants before entering a car and opening a closed container they reasonably believe contains drugs or some other criminal evidence.

Voted 7-2 to uphold federal sentencing guidelines that result in people convicted of trafficking in the hallucinogenic drug LSD getting longer prison terms for relatively small amounts of LSD.
 In the prosecutor-immunity case, the court drew a distinction between a prosecutor advising police and the many other aspects of the job. Advising police is not "so intimately associated with the judicial phase of the criminal process that it qualifies for absolute immunity," White wrote.

Prosecutors nationwide enjoy absolute protection against being sued for filing charges, seeking convictions in court and most other official duties. And Thursday's decision said prosecutors are absolutely immune from being sued for eliciting false statements in court proceedings.

The ruling on police advice was a preliminary victory for Cathy Burns of Muncie, who came under police suspicion after a shooting at her home Sept. 2, 1982.

Mrs. Burns said an intruder knocked her unconscious and shot and wounded her two sons, Eddie Griffin and Danny Sells, while they slept.

The two policemen who investigated the case suspected Mrs. Burns might have had a split personality, and asked Delaware County Chief Deputy Prosecutor Richard Reed if they could hypnotize her. He recommended it.

The police officers said they doubted the technique was legit.

California wants to put bite into pretzel-and-chip crowd

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — A proposed tax on some snack foods to help ease California's \$14 billion budget gap would put the bite on the pretzel-and-chip crowd but exempt the

wealthy who nibble caviar and bric critics say.
 The proposal is part of Republican Gov. Pete Wilson's plan to balance the budget, estimated at \$55 billion.

Representatives of the elderly, business, minorities, labor and consumers oppose the legislation. They call the tax unfair because it hits the poor the hardest.

House makes deep cuts in military bill

WASHINGTON — The House approved an \$8.5 billion military construction bill on Thursday that slashes President Bush's budget request for overseas work while earmarking millions for lawmakers' favored domestic projects.

By a vote of 392-18, the House adopted the legislation providing funds to build military facilities and family housing, with debate and final passage taking less than an hour.

Despite Bush administration criticism, the bill reduces the fiscal 1992-U.S. contribution to the NATO Infrastructure Fund from the \$359 million sought by the president to \$159 million.

The difference is offset by funds for domestic projects, including \$471 million for the National Guard and Reserve — \$189 million more than Bush's request for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.

Kennedy ordered to undergo treatment

QUINCY, Mass. — Joan Kennedy, the former wife of Sen. Edward Kennedy, was found guilty Thursday of drunken driving and ordered to check into an alcohol treatment center.

Mrs. Kennedy was arrested May 14 when police noticed her car swerving across three lanes of the Southeast Expressway.

Judge Albert Kramer sentenced Mrs. Kennedy to 14 days in an alcohol rehabilitation center and 90 days in jail, with the jail term suspended unless another violation occurs in the next two years, said Kramer's assistant, Bill McPherson. Kramer also ordered Mrs. Kennedy to attend outpatient therapy after she is released from the undisclosed center. She had surrendered her driver's license to Kramer the day after her arrest.

U.S. Army colonel denies conspiracy

WASHINGTON — An Army colonel who resigned as head of the Pentagon's search for servicemen missing in action presented little evidence of the conspiracy he contends is blocking progress on the issue, a House subcommittee chairman said Thursday.

Chief A. Peck testified under oath before the House Foreign Affairs Asia subcommittee, repeating many of the charges contained in his bitter Feb. 12 resignation memorandum.

Later, subcommittee Chairman Stephen Solarz, D-N.Y., told reporters that Peck had not offered "convincing evidence of some kind of Machiavellian conspiracy to suppress the truth."

Noriega fed CIA secrets

MIAMI (AP) — Manuel Noriega fed the CIA secrets on the Panama Canal negotiations and conducted important U.S. intelligence operations, the government confirmed in a classified narrative released Thursday.

Prosecutors, however, strongly denied that U.S. authorities approved the drug trafficking that led to the deposed Panamanian leader's indictment.

The government's account was contained in a partly censored 31-page response to the defense's request for secret U.S. documents.

Much of the narrative written by Assistant U.S. Attorney James McAdams disputed the defense's need for classified documents. But prosecutors agreed Noriega supplied his own country while serving as Panama's intelligence chief.

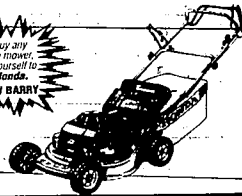
"That information ranged from incidental information to the negotiating posture of the Panamanian government — during the Panama Canal negotiations," prosecutors said.

"In addition, he supported U.S. government programs in Panama, some of which were important intelligence operations."

In a 1978 treaty, the United States and Panama agreed to a gradual takeover by Panama of the canal, which is in a zone controlled by the U.S. military.

Uranium accident prompts alert at nuclear plant

WILMINGTON, N.C. (AP) — Workers began a slow process Thursday of extracting 330 pounds of highly radioactive uranium that accidentally contaminated a tank of liquid waste at a nuclear fuel plant, authorities said.

Federal inspectors declared an alert and kept a round-the-clock vigil but allowed the GE Nuclear Fuel and Components Manufacturing Facility to continue operating. No injuries or radiation exposure were reported.

There was no danger of a nuclear explosion, but an "unlikely" potential for spontaneous fission, a reaction that would release radioactivity, exists until uranium levels are lowered by two-thirds, federal officials said.

"They have declared an alert at the plant," said Ken Clark, a spokesman for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in Atlanta. "That is the second lowest level of emergency classification. There are four emergency classifications."

A spokesman for the plant's owner, General Electric Co., said the waste system tank holds 20,000 gallons of liquid, mostly water.

NASA says safety system improved

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — NASA said Thursday it will improve the shuttle safety system to make sure equipment problems don't "sneak up and bite us" like they did during Columbia's countdown last week.

Top agency officials said they have no qualms about the fuel temperature sensors just installed in Columbia for Saturday's launch attempt.

The first countdown for the biomedical research mission was halted for fear the components might break and cause the ship to explode.

Bush arms control plan faces tough battle

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — President Bush's call for Middle-East arms control comes as countries throughout the region are trying to bolster their arsenals and weapons makers worldwide are desperate for foreign sales to cope with post-Cold War cutbacks at home.

Even as Bush made his proposal during a speech Wednesday in Colorado, two key U.S. allies were seeking new weapons. Saudi Arabia announced plans to make its own tank. Israel lobbied Defense Secretary Dick Cheney to increase funds for its new Arrow anti-missile missile.

Egypt in April announced plans to buy 46 Turkish-built F-16 fighter planes and received U.S. encouragement.

Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates are seeking billions of dollars worth of U.S. arms.

Syria reportedly has purchased North Korean Scud missiles and may be trying to buy new, more accurate Chinese missiles.

Even impoverished Jordan recently tried to revive a deal for French Mirage 2000 fighter jets that has been stalled by financing problems.

This shopping list is relatively modest in an area that has gobbled up imported arms for years. Many Middle East countries face financial problems that have cut their budget, if not their appetite, for arms.

Many might welcome a chance to spend money on public services rather than weapons, if they

could feel certain that potential foes would do likewise.

The Bush plan would ban the spread of nuclear weapons and surface-to-surface missiles. It also asks major arms suppliers to agree on restraining sales of planes, tanks, rockets and other conventional arms.

But that poses problems for the suppliers.

The decline of East-West conflict has led both NATO and former Warsaw Pact countries to cut arms budgets. Their arms makers must find other markets or risk going out of business — creating political problems at home and weakening long-term military strength.

Iraq, Kurd talks hit snag

LONDON (AP) — Negotiations between Iraq and the Kurds to establish an autonomous Kurdistan have hit a snag over the proposed borders, a Kurdish leader said Thursday.

Jalal Talabani, leader of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan, told the British Broadcasting Corp. that Iraq refused to recognize the Kurds' claim to several cities in northern Iraq, including the oil center of Kirkuk.

"We are asking that all Kurdish towns and territory must be included

in the autonomous Kurdistan," Talabani told the BBC in an interview by satellite phone from his headquarters near Sulaymaniyah.

Iraq has refused to cede Kirkuk, which produced nearly 34 million gallons of oil a day before the Persian Gulf War. Iraq in total produced nearly 143 million gallons of oil a day at that time. Almost two weeks ago, Kurdish leaders announced they had reached a broad agreement with Iraq that would lead to self-rule for the Kurds.

Bomb most likely didn't cause crash

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Early indications from the investigation into the crash of an Austrian jet are pointing away from a bomb, experts close to the probe said Thursday.

One said speculation now focuses on engine failure. But the investigators all stressed that no firm conclusions could be drawn yet and no possibility had been excluded.

Meanwhile, the jet's "black boxes" were being sent to the National Transportation and Safety Board in Washington for examination. Thai officials said.

The Lauda Air Boeing 767 crashed late Sunday in northwest Thailand, 16 minutes after takeoff from Bangkok.

All 224 people aboard the plane were killed. It was the first crash of a Boeing 767 and the 12th worst in commercial aviation history.

Previously, speculation had focused on a bomb. But one European aviation expert close to the investigation said Thursday that "no evidence of any sort of explosive device" had been found so far.

"Most attention is now focused on the possibility of an engine implosion," said the expert, speaking on condition of anonymity.

He said that one wing, with an engine attached, was found 12 miles from the rest of the wreckage and significantly intact, possibly indicating the wing broke off first and then the plane crashed.

However, other experts have said the distance of the wing from the wreckage is in dispute.

In Seattle, Boeing spokesman Jack Gamble challenged the claim that one wing was found 12 miles from the wreckage.

Waite to spend another birthday in captivity

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Anglican Church envoy Terry Waite is to spend his fourth consecutive birthday in captivity on Friday amid hopes that shifting Middle East alliances will win freedom for him and other Western hostages.

The British envoy, who will be 52, vanished in Beirut on Jan. 20, 1987, during his fifth mission to Lebanon to help free American hostages held by pro-Iranian Shiite, Muslim fundamentalists.

He ditched his Druse Muslim bodyguards to meet with member of Islamic Jihad, or Islamic Holy War, but wound up being kidnapped.

No group has ever claimed to hold Waite. But several former hostages released by the Shites have said that they had been held with Waite.





Dierkes project will be a fine community asset

The new Centennial Waterfront Park will be a tough act to follow, but by all indications the proposed facility awaiting nearby Dierkes Lake Park will be something special.

The plan, up for consideration by the Twin Falls Planning and Zoning Commission after a series of public hearings, envisions a package of improvements at the venerable Dierkes Lake-Shoshone Falls park complex. The jewel in the crown would be a rock-wall amphitheater, with a spectacular view of the Snake River, the falls and canyon.

The plans submitted by the Boise landscape architecture firm of Beck & Baird include a menu of options, depending on the amount of money available. Those alternatives include softball diamonds; an information kiosk near the lake, playground equipment, handicapped-accessible walking paths, a canoe launch, arboretum, botanical gardens and another Shoshone Falls overlook west of the existing one.

Various state and federal money can be tapped for such a project, and as the Twin Falls Rotary Club demonstrated in its fund-raising effort for the Centennial Waterfront Park, there's no shortage of interest in developing quality recreation sites.

Moreover, the option is there of adding other features in the future.

It's an impressive plan, and one we can afford without adding much to the tax burden.

But at least equally as impressive has been the work of P&Z Commission Chairman Donna Brizee and the amphitheater's longtime supporter, Bob Sojka, in steering this project through perilous political waters.

As the Centennial Waterfront Park project demonstrated, there are dozens of constituencies with an interest in such endeavors, any one of which can scuttle such a project.

The Centennial project very nearly sank on the issue of the use of motor-boats and jet skis along that stretch of the river, and there are dozens of potential shoals that still could threaten the Dierkes Lake project.

Still to be addressed are the condition of the access road, the cost of admission to the park and how that money will be used.

But the park planners have gone out of their way to get all of the interested groups and individuals in on the ground floor of this project, and the payoff — so far — has been near-consensus that the new Dierkes Lake Park should be a part of Twin Falls' future.

It's been a case study on how to get a community project off the ground by making it the community's idea.

More funds, time and effort needed to improve lives of disabled

When athlete Bo Jackson or singer Gloria Estefan suffer a disabling injury, the nation follows their rehabilitation anxiously. Why, then, are we doing such a poor job of helping \$5 million other Americans with disabling conditions?

That's one of every seven Americans, making disability a problem that affects every neighborhood and family. Over a 73-year life span, the average American spends 13 years with impairments that interfere with normal activities. The cost to the nation in medical treatment, income support to replace lost earnings and rehabilitation services is more than \$170 billion annually.

This is an immense toll. For the most part, it also is a preventable one. I chaired a committee of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences that recently formulated a national agenda for preventing disability. We found that millions of disabilities could be prevented or made far less disabling. The problem is not primarily medical, although improved medical care is required. Rather, it is our collective complac-

ency about allowing some conditions to progress needlessly to disabilities.

"Disability is the gap between a person's capability and the demands or expectations of society. For too long, we have viewed the former with resignation and the latter as beyond control. As a humane society that celebrates individualism in human beings and seeks to avoid suffering, it is our view we must change.

Most conditions that lead to disability are preventable.

They include premature birth, malnutrition, social and educational deprivation in childhood, automobile crashes and other injuries, violence, alcohol and other drug abuse and chronic diseases. When the conditions do occur, the resultant physical or mental impairment often can be reversed or minimized by prompt medical care and rehabilitative services.

Even if the impairment becomes a perma-

nent-functioning limitation, it need not prevent someone from working and participating fully in family and social life. But training, assistive devices, transportation, housing and adaptable workplaces are essential.

Consider stroke, which often leads to disability. Among the causes of stroke are lack of physical fitness, overeating, stress and failure to treat hypertension.

All these factors can be ameliorated, as can many other causes of heart disease, respiratory problems, hearing loss and other disabling conditions.

Or think about the 1.3 million people who sustain head injuries each year. Many are teen-age males involved in car crashes, falls or violence.

For many of them, emergency care is too slow, rehabilitation services are inadequate and long-term follow-up assistance is lacking to help the young men re-enter a full life.

Physicians and allied health professionals alone cannot solve these problems, although

their roles should be expanded. To prevent so many Americans from slipping into dependency, the rest of society, including lawmakers, highway designers, employers, social workers, neighborhood organizations and others must also get involved.

Insurance policies, for those having them, generally cover rehabilitation services only in acute-care hospitals and only for a month or two afterward. Coverage ends when hospitalization is completed and the condition has stabilized — just when post-acute rehabilitation should begin for many traumatic injuries and chronic conditions.

An elderly person who needs a lifting device to get into a car generally needs it one through Medicare, which deems this and many other kinds of medical equipment as "convenience items." Inconvenience items are "non-reimbursable." For want of a ride or out of fear of incontinence, some elderly people lost their mobility.

The Americans With Disabilities Act passed last year was a historic accomplish-

ment, prohibiting discrimination against people with disabilities in hiring, transportation and other activities. But the greater challenge remains.

"We must prevent the injuries, birth defects and other conditions that often lead to disabilities and deter existing conditions from progressing to the point of disability.

When impairments do occur, we must strive to overcome them — not only with better medical care but with social services, job training and much more to promote independence and improve the quality of life.

As many as two of every three disabilities could be prevented through disease and injury control, better health services and other initiatives. Millions of Americans now are disabled simply because we lack the will for prevention.

Dr. Alvin R. Tarlov, of the New England Medical Center and Harvard School of Public Health, chaired a committee of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences that developed a national agenda for the prevention of disabilities.

and chemical reactor where it is filtered, diluted, chemically treated, and aged.

The first action from a spill would be an immediate filtering or removing anything which is in suspension. This action would occur in a relatively small distance, easily measured in feet and long before reaching the aquifer 500 feet below the surface. There would also be some immediate evaporation, putting a few gases and water vapors into the air.

There would be a dilution of the water as it came in contact with the aquifer. As this diluted water percolates through the earth, ionic change would occur in which one element or compound is substituted for another.

In this process, probably all radioactive elements would be captured by the soil, sand and stone through which the water travels. Natural elements would be dissolved to replace the ones lost. There would be some clinging, like paint, and some suspension in non-peculiar basins. The only action peculiar to a spill of radioactive material is the radioactive decay, which dissipates the radioactivity as time goes by.

ment decision are the most worrisome of all.

The governor has taken a popular stand against the Department of Energy. That stand, however, was taken without the backing of law, without scientific justification and worst of all, without any debate or vote on the question.

We need to settle the question of radioactive residue by public debate after learning all of the facts — not by the governor's edict.

Information from around the world confirms that radiation is not nearly as deadly as the public perceives it to be and that nuclear accidents do not cause the amount of death and destruction often imagined.

The positive medical advances by far offset any loss of life from nuclear power or nuclear research. The INEL in any role is a positive asset for Idaho.

Lawmakers seek \$60-million cap on WIPP

WASHINGTON (AP) — Backers of a bill to open the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant in southern New Mexico say the state shouldn't receive more than \$60 million for a five-year test at the nuclear waste repository.

But New Mexico officials say they have been working with the federal government to secure nearly twice that amount for the test phase.

The U.S. Department of Energy and the state have been negotiating a deal under which New Mexico would receive \$100 million during the five years — \$20 million a year — to help prepare roads and bypasses for tracking nuclear waste across the state.

But Rep. George Miller, D-Calif., and Rep. Peter Kostmayer, D-Pa., co-sponsors of a Democratic WIPP land-withdrawal bill, contend that would be too much.

They want to place a \$60 million cap on compensation to New Mexico for the test phase.

"It's more than an adequate amount," said Miller, chairman of the House Energy and Insular Affairs Committee.

The bill they introduced Tuesday would withdraw more than 10,000 acres southeast of Carlsbad, N.M., from public access by transferring the site from the Interior Department to the DOE.

"Miller and Kostmayer are very confused," said Rep. Joe Skeen, R-N.M., who earlier introduced his own land-withdrawal bill for WIPP.

"They don't understand what the compensation issue is all about and what New Mexico has negotiated with DOE over the years.

"We're not through with the compensation argument yet," Skeen said.

Skeen's bill calls for \$20 million a year in compensation for New Mexico until WIPP is decommissioned, then \$13 million annually after decommissioning — until activities at WIPP cease.

Bill will pay for river dredging

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House has approved \$8 million for the Columbia and Snake rivers to keep Idaho's Port of Lewiston open.

The appropriation is part of the annual Energy and Water Development Appropriations bill, which the House approved Wednesday 392-24 and sent to the Senate.

Rep. Larry LaRocco, D-Idaho, said he pushed for the funding in an April 29 letter to Rep. Tom Bevill, D-Ala., chairman of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Energy and Water Development.

also voted for the appropriation.

"I'm glad we were able to appropriate this money to help keep the Port of Lewiston operating," LaRocco said in a news release. "More than 17 million tons of cargo were shipped between Lewiston and Portland in 1989. Idaho's only port is obviously an essential part of the state's economy." The money is needed to ensure that the Port of Lewiston and other ports on the upper Columbia and lower Snake rivers remain open if the water behind four lower Snake River dams is drawn down to minimum levels to help salmon smolts migrate to the Pacific Ocean.





Northwestern senators criticize Endangered Species Act

PORTLAND (AP) — Sens. Bob Packwood of Oregon and Slade Gorton of Washington say the Endangered Species Act is a roadblock to progress.

The 1973 federal law protects wildlife but is insensitive to the economic and societal needs of people, the Republican senators said during a day-long symposium on declining runs of wild salmon.

Packwood said if the Endangered Species Act had been around 50 years ago, hydroelectric dams on the Columbia River and the Columbia Gorge highway probably would never have been built.

"I have to ask, are there any consequences so severe that you might consider the possibility and the risk of the elimination of some species?" Packwood said on Wednesday.

"The word 'balance' appears over and over again," he said about the symposium's theme of saving Northwest industries as well as wild salmon.

"Balance means exactly what all of us understand it to mean," he said. "Not that the Endangered Species Act is the Holy Grail and everything else is subsidiary."

Congress meant well, Gorton said, but the process "has been turned into an indiscriminate club which various interest groups are using to reverse decisions made in the last half-century."

"You are here because you have felt the first few blows from this club," he said. "I

am here to tell you, you ain't seen nothing yet."

The senators' comments were harshly criticized by the attorney for Oregon Trout, the Portland conservation group seeking federal protection for four stocks of Columbia and Snake river salmon under the Endangered Species Act.

"They're polarizing the region," Richard Braun said. "It's the most dangerous thing you can do right now."

Braun said his group has gone out of its way to work on salmon recovery proposals that would have only minimal impact on the Northwest economy.

"Unfortunately, what seems to be happening is politicians are infighting people," he said. "That is certainly going to spell disaster for any kind of reasonable debate."

The symposium, titled "Saving the Wild Salmon," was sponsored by the Columbia River Alliance for Fish and Commerce, a group representing most of the commercial and industrial interests along the river.

It was held to address issues raised by the recent recommendation from the National Marine Fisheries Service to list Snake River sockeye salmon as an endangered species. The agency is scheduled to make its recommendation June 7 on three stocks of Snake River sockeye and wild coho on the lower Columbia.

Speakers stressed "societal tradeoffs" needed to protect wild salmon.

They said commercial activity on the Columbia — hydropower and aluminum production, shipping and irrigation — is part of the quality of life.

"You cannot unscramble an egg, and so it is with the Columbia River system," said Graham Galt, professor of animal sciences and genetics specialist at the University of California at Davis.

Saving wild salmon is possible, but people who live in the Northwest must determine what they are willing to give up in return, Galt said.

Most speakers appeared resigned to the fact that at least some Columbia and Snake salmon runs will wind up on the endangered species list.

They said commercial activity on the Columbia — hydropower and aluminum production, shipping and irrigation — is part of the quality of life.

Court upholds prison term for teen

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Supreme Court has upheld the minimum 15-year prison term imposed on a 14-year-old Boise boy who laid in wait to kill his father.

The high court split 4-1 in rejecting claims by Jeremy Broadhead that the sentence imposed by 4th District Judge George Carey exceeded his discretion and amounted to cruel and unusual punishment.

"We conclude that reasonable minds might differ as to whether a 15-year fixed term, or some lesser term, is necessary to protect society from Jeremy Broadhead," Justice Byron Johnson wrote for the majority.

"It was a reasonable view of the facts for the trial court to conclude that a 15-year fixed term was necessary to protect society," Johnson wrote. "Under those circumstances, we will not substitute our view."

Justice Stephen Bistline was the lone dissenter. He contended Carey improperly imposed the sentence out of vengeance, laying out and then ignoring the fact that prison is inappropriate for a child, offers no therapeutic help and would place Broadhead at risk from other inmates because of his age.

Broadhead was charged with first-degree murder after he admitted to friends that he waited for his father Steven to come home and then killed him with a rifle.

He later pleaded guilty to second-degree murder and was sentenced to life in prison with no possibility of parole until after serving 15 years.

Broadhead is being held at a secure facility at the state Youth Services Center in St. Anthony until Corrections Department officials determine he can be placed in an adult prison.

In rejecting the contention that the sentence was cruel and unusual, three members of the court agreed to overrule any previous Supreme Court decisions holding that sentences falling within the legally allowed limits on their face complied with constitutional guarantees against cruel and unusual punishment.

Johnson wrote that even if a sentence was legal, it still had to be proportional to the sentences imposed on others convicted in similar circumstances.

While there have been a number of teen-agers sentenced for murder to minimum terms less than half the one imposed on Broadhead, Johnson cited a minimum 15-year sentence imposed on a 17-year-old convicted of voluntary manslaughter and a life sentence with no possibility of parole on an 18-year-old convicted of first-degree murder. Equally harsh sentences, he said, have been imposed on teen-age murderers in other states, he said.

Potlatch man pleads innocent to farmer's murder

MOSCOW (AP) — Roger Dale Babb of Potlatch faces a Sept. 9 trial after pleading innocent to first-degree murder in the March 9 shooting death of Latah County farmer Ronald Boone.

Babb, 35, was returned to the Latah County Jail after appearing Wednesday before 2nd District Judge John Bengtson for the slaying of Ronald Boone. The farmer died of a gunshot wound and was found lying on his bed with his own .22-caliber semiautomatic pistol beside him.

Babb's common-law wife, Kathy Spencer, also is charged with murdering Boone. A preliminary hearing for her is scheduled to begin June 6.

An earlier charge was dropped against Spencer, but Latah County Prosecutor Craig Mosman refuted it.

Latah County Magistrate William Hamlett concluded at Babb's preliminary hearing last week that Boone probably was shot in the head while he slept after Babb assumed Boone had sex with Spencer.

Babb's court-appointed attorney, argued at the hearing that with sexual passion as a motive, Babb should be bound over on a charge of manslaughter rather than first-degree murder. But Hamlett denied the request, saying Boone was shot as he slept, showing premeditation.

Grube bound over for trial in case of 1983 killing of 15-year-old girl

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — Rauland Grube has been bound over for trial in 7th District Court on a charge of first-degree murder for the 1983 shotgun slaying of a 15-year-old Ashton girl.

After a two-day preliminary hearing, Fremont County Magistrate Keith Walker ordered Grube, 27, of Ashton, held in the Fremont County Jail without bond Thursday pending arraignment before 7th District Judge Grant Young.

A court clerk said no date had been set for Grube's arraignment.

In testimony Thursday, a former Idaho Department of Law Enforcement investigator who was assigned to the slaying of Amy Hossner, said Grube's shotgun could not have made the pattern of pellets found on the girl's body.

But Jim Mason's testimony con-

flicted with a statement by Fremont County sheriff's deputy at an earlier hearing that an FBI laboratory found correlations between Grube's shotgun and the murder scene.

Grube was arrested May 15 for Miss Hossner's slaying. The girl was found dead in her downstairs bedroom the morning of June 4, 1983.

Mason said 1983 tests by a federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms laboratory indicated that Grube's shotgun was not the murder weapon.

Tests showed two other shotguns, taken from the Ashton Police Department and former officer Steve Brood's home, could have produced the pattern, Mason said, but he did not know whether either could be linked to the murder.

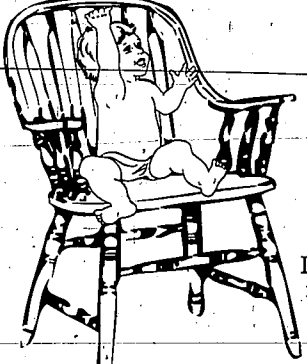

Commission sued to seal workers' records

BOISE (AP) — Workers who have been injured on the job are suing the Idaho Industrial Commission in an attempt to seal accident records and prevent "blacklisting" by prospective employers.

But three out-of-state companies want those records to sell to employers.

At stake are hundreds of thousands of government files on injured workers wanted by businesses to screen applicants, mostly for physically demanding jobs.

If the lawsuit is successful, reports on workers' compensation claims and injury-related lawsuits and detailed medical information contained in them would be deemed off-limits to public scrutiny.

Opponents, however, say the information helps employers judge whether a job candidate poses an unreasonable liability risk.

Boise attorneys pressing the legal action say their primary purpose is to prevent employers from discriminating against job applicants who have previously filed legitimate injury claims.

The vast majority of those workers, the attorneys say, have fully recovered from their injuries and are as fit as the next person for the job.

Representing seven previously injured workers from Boise to Pocatello, attorneys John Green-

field and Gardner Skinner Jr. filed the suit Tuesday in 4th District Court. The industrial commission is the only named defendant.

"It's the ultimate irony that a system designed to help workers may now hurt them," Greenfield said Wednesday. "It's an invasion of privacy to use records that are essentially private to systematically discriminate."

Tapping weighty legal issues of privacy vs. the public's right to know, the case is expected to ultimately find its way to the Idaho Supreme Court.

The legal move narrowly heads off the four-member commission's scheduled June 1 release of thousands of workers' compensation files to three out-of-state companies that market the data to employers.

Avert Inc. of Fort Collins, Colo., DAC Services of Tulsa, Okla., and Benefit Management Associates Inc. of Hingham, Mass., have asked for computer tapes containing Idaho's workers' compensation data base, dating back decades.

Nearly 43,000 injury claims, representing 9.3 percent of the entire state work force, were filed in 1990-91 alone, a 7.6 percent jump from the previous year.

Because of the suit, however, commissioners have halted release of the data.

"They basically will try to preserve the status

quo until the court is able to rule on this," said Special Deputy Attorney General Patrick Costello, who represents the commission.

The commission on Wednesday also temporarily ceased its practice of running computer searches on prospective workers at the request of Idaho employers. Those background searches now will be conducted only with the written permission of individual applicants, Costello said.

Greenfield and Skinner intend to prove workers' compensation files must be closed under a general exemption for medical records in the state open-records law, which took effect July 1, 1990.

But companies nationwide, responding to soaring costs of health care and workers' compensation insurance, say they cannot afford to hire workers who may be unfit.

Proponents of the applicant-screening practice also argue it weeds out prospective workers who are lying about never having been injured on the job. The Idaho Press Club, which represents the state's working journalists, expressed serious concerns about the lawsuit.

This is a dangerous move, club board member Craig Lincoln of Twin Falls said. "If successful, it will basically close a public agency with a great deal of power, creating a superagency."

Pocatello doctor faces battery charges

POCATELLO (AP) — A Pocatello orthopedist has been charged with aggravated battery for allegedly running down two men on a motorcycle after an argument.

Police Detective Capt. Lynn Harris said Dr. Howard W. Mott allegedly got into shouting match with two young men on a motorcycle while driving on Yellowstone Avenue last Saturday evening.

Mott reportedly crossed into the motorcycle's lane, running into the bike and knocking it over.

Sudden deafness can't hold back success for Ketchum filmmaker

KETCHUM - Images captured through the lenses of David Butterfield's cameras have thrilled millions of moviegoers.

In eight years of filmmaking, the action-packed moments produced by the 32-year-old Ketchum resident have been distributed around the world, often to rave reviews. Butterfield has been a leading cameraman for the famous Warren Miller ski films, produced annually and screened wherever skiers gather. He also has his own independent film company, Diamond Sun Productions, which makes instructional videos and documentaries.

All of this has been achieved despite

the sudden deafness that struck Butterfield nine years ago, at age 23.

"I just woke up one morning and my hearing was gone," he said. No illness preceded the loss. There was no forewarning. Unexpectedly, the sense had been robbed from him.

"I wouldn't want to put my worst enemy through the experience," Butterfield said. Batteries of medical tests revealed little. For some reason the hair cells inside Butterfield's cochlea had

died. He suffered near total loss of hearing and balance. And no one could tell him when, or if, either would return.

"Every day I kept waiting for it to come back," Butterfield said of his hearing. "Finally, after a time, I quit waiting."

Butterfield was a student at the University of Colorado in Boulder, Colo., at the time, studying humanities with an emphasis in film. He had dreams of go-

ing to film school at the American Film Institute or the University of Southern California, but his deafness thwarted that hope. How would he hear the lectures? What school would accept a deaf filmmaker?

Butterfield reclaimed his balance, using sight clues. He added sign- and lip-reading to his vocabulary. And he adapted his working methods to minimize his handicap.

"Deafness forced me to see more efficiently," he said. "I learned to trust my eyes."

Butterfield's filmmaking career actually began after he lost his hearing. He purchased his own camera equipment and began practicing in earnest. Six months later he sold his first professional footage to Warren Miller.

Women head march of country music into '90s

In country music, the men tend to wear the boots and the 10-gallon hats. Women are expected to stand by their men and, according to Tom Pall & the Glaser Brothers, "Put Another Log on the Fire."

But the times they are a-changin' in Nashville.

Women singers are proliferating within country music's ranks. And the new breed is kicking country's macho Western roots right in the Levi's.

Or, as Jann Browne sings: "I don't wring my hands and moan/Hopin' that you'll phon/c/I don't do floors anymore."

"There seems to be a real resurgence in the importance of women artists in country," said

Bill Ivey, director of the Country Music Foundation. "I do think we're getting into a nice balance where you have maybe a half-dozen good female country vocalists who are, I think, re-establishing the place of women in country music that may have dipped during the '80s."

If anything, Ivey is estimating on the short side. As country charges into the '90s as per

haps the most progressive and exciting of musical genres, women — both veterans and new comers — are at the head of the march. A look at the latest album charts finds established acts such as Dolly Parton, Reba McEntire, Kathy Mattea, the Judds, the Forester Sisters and K.T. Oslin with records in the Top 20.

Paintings by pachyderm Picasso fetching more than just peanuts

LOS ANGELES - Ruby is a wild young artist from Arizona who is heavy into her work. She can be a real beast, but when Ruby puts her nose to it, the result is unforgettable.

Afficionados, including many in Southern California, pay hundreds of dollars apiece and wait up to 18 months for her artwork. And since making her debut a little more than a year ago, Ruby has produced nearly 100 paintings.

Not bad for a 17-year-old Asian elephant from the Phoenix Zoo who holds paintbrushes with her trunk.

John Moffitt of Pasadena was Ruby's first client. The 72-year-old entrepreneur has three of her originals, an option on a fourth, five lithographs and five more lithos on order. He has paid upwards of \$500 for works by this pachyderm Picasso.

"I don't care what people think," he said. "People see her paintings and they don't know an elephant did it. If an elephant did it, it wouldn't have bought it."

Moffitt was allowed to watch as Ruby created her first commissioned work. That day he wore a blue blazer, white shirt, camel-colored slacks and a red tie, and Ruby used those hues in the painting.

Terry McHale, 43, of San Pedro remembers the anxious anticipation before she plunked down \$250 for a Ruby original.

"I read about her and her one-elfphant show, but by the

time I got in touch with someone, they were totally sold out," she said.

The painting she finally procured is an 18-inch by 24-inch horizontal in bright aqua and turquoise with a touch of purple and a signature in the shape of a large, graceful A. It's anyone's guess what the letter stands for.

"You know that an elephant did this," she said. "There are flecks of hay and things like that that other artists wouldn't have on their nails when they paint."

She has turned her love of Ruby into a traveling project for elementary school students. She exhibits the painting and conducts a talk about Ruby, other elephants and ecology in general.

"I've always been fascinated by elephants, dolphins, gorillas, animals with intelligence," she said. "That this was done by an elephant is doubly exciting. People's reaction is really unbelievable."

"Some say, 'What a kooky thing,' and 'Why would that be of importance?' Modern art from a lot of artists isn't as palatable to the eye as this, so I say why not?"

Ruby has made more than \$40,000 for the Phoenix Zoo since her debut in Scottsdale, Ariz., on April 14, 1990. She recently had a showing at Arizona State University in Tempe.

Ruby's artistic career began as a bonding experience, said Phoenix Zoo spokesman Dick George. "It was something the keepers devised to help build the bond of confidence between them and Ruby," he said.

Filmmakers showing more interest in Idaho

SANDBOARD (AP) - For heaven's sake, don't mention "Heaven's Gate."
 Even though it was the biggest movie project ever in Idaho and poured plenty of Hollywood money into Wallace while the film crew was on location, the movie itself was an epic flop.
 The industry is touchy about epic flops.
 "Heaven's Gate" is conspicuously absent from the cover of the state Department of Commerce's Idaho Production Guide. What the 160-page publication does list are recognizable films, TV commercials, site locations and services that might lure Hollywood and New York producers to work their magic in the Gem State.
 Peg Crist is a film specialist with the Commerce Department's Idaho Film Bureau who was founded in August 1987 and at first fielded only a trickle of inquiries from filmmakers.
 The office received fewer than 50 calls in its first year. But interest more than doubled in Crist's first year on the job and she expects the bureau to respond to requests for information from more than 400 project-planners during the current fiscal year.
 "It's a numbers game," Crist said. "The more inquiries you get, the more likely you are to get a film project."
 Idaho has hosted movie crews on an infrequent basis since the 1940s, when "Northwest Passage" was filmed in the McCall area, but has never had a blockbuster to add to its credits. What Crist is looking for is a release on the order of South Dakota's "Dances with Wolves," Kevin Costner's Oscar-winning smash, to

put the state's scenery before millions of viewers.
 "The state had experienced some large numbers before, but it would be \$5 million one year, \$100,000 the next, depending on whether Clint Eastwood felt like making a movie here," the film specialist said.
 Eastwood used central Idaho's Stanley Basin and "Bronco Billy" also was shot in the state. But neither was a box office smash.
 "When you get a classic, a huge moneymaker, it gets out in the public a little longer," Crist said. "It's written about more in the industry trades and we get more mileage."
 Majestic mountains, sweeping valleys, unusual landscapes and quaint little towns give Idaho built-in appeal. But sweetening the bottom-line seems to be just as important as the natural backdrop when it comes time to talk business.
 Producers are looking for a deal. With the cost of making movies spiraling, the expense of transportation, lodging, meals and temporary payroll for on-site crews has become an increasingly important factor.
 Filmmakers are going to look for a place where they can stretch their budgets," Crist said. "If they had a lot of money, they'd just build a town on some back lot in Southern California."
 And with the \$150,000 estimated average cost of a day of shooting on location, Idaho communities have a vested interest in making themselves an attractive alternative.
 "Evidently, most communities are receptive to the idea of being the filming site of a day of shooting on location, Idaho communities have a vested interest in making themselves an attractive alternative."

impact, they would be even more receptive.
 Singletary traveled to Los Angeles with Crist in March to push northern Idaho at the National Location Expo. The international marketing convention is set up to allow location managers to shop around and compare upcoming projects with potential new sites.
 The Idaho representatives stood together at a booth handing out hundreds of visitors guides and copies of the Idaho Production Guide. All around them, other states and foreign countries had exhibits that Singletary described as "about a city block long" and very impressive.
 "I've always known this was a big business, but you're never really prepared for how large it is," he said.
 Idaho may not be getting the kind of business some of the competition

is enjoying, but Singletary said he is confident filmmakers will see the state's big screen potential once they have a chance to explore the scenery.
 "If it's promoted properly, we might have just the right curvy road or lake or old building they're looking for," he said.
 Last year's 3 1/2-week shooting of "A Talent for the Game" deposited about \$1 million in Coeur d'Alene's economy.
 And while the smaller town of Genesee, where most of the actual filming took place, saw none of the money spent on hotel rooms, meals, bar tabs and shopping trips, it did get some major improvements to its town ball park, including new out-houses and a rebuilt snack bar.
 "In a little town of 700 people," Crist said, "that's a nice perk for the community."

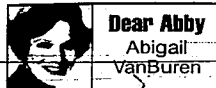

Bob Vila's 'Home Again' hammers away at affordable housing

LOS ANGELES (AP) — After 10 years of helping millions of homeowners do it themselves on public television's "This Old House," architectural school dropout Bob Vila is hammering away at more affordable housing these days.



Vila

season last year had 39 episodes, about 15 more than the average series.

The series' next season will feature the restoration of a Craftsman house in Florida. Vila and his partner, Michael Ferrone, are deciding between restoring an old Victorian house or a ranch house to complete the season.

Vila grew up in Miami and graduated from the University of Florida with a degree in journalism in 1969.

"I dropped out of the school of architecture because I couldn't do the math," he said. "Architecture has changed since then, and there's less emphasis on math. There was a period when I thought I would become a writer. But it just never happened because my love of architecture got the better of me."

After service in the Peace Corps, Vila went to Germany to work for a civilian newspaper for American servicemen.

"That was a time of heavy drugs in the military," he said. "I'd be investigating the drugs and killing of officers. The man I was taking over from wanted to give me a gun to protect myself. I said 'I didn't want a newspaper job where I had to carry a gun.'"

Instead, he spent the next two years working as a free-lance editor and creating scenery for the Stuttgart Ballet.

When he returned to this country, he settled in Boston and enrolled in the Back Bay Architectural Center.

"I studied at night and worked during the day," he said. "The second year, I started my own business restoring old houses. I progressed so much I left school. I figured it'd take me five years to finish school, and when I got out I'd be one of a thousand graduates competing for a few openings as a \$12,000-a-year architect."

"His syndicated 'Home Again With Bob Vila' also builds on a broader base than the Boston-produced PBS program, featuring home improvement jobs all over the country," Vila said. "We said we would feature affordable remodeling. The last project I did on the public television show cost \$400,000. We try to be more in the real world."

"It's been a challenge to make my new show different. ... We've concentrated on affordability and looking at other parts of the country besides just New England."

Vila was fired from "This Old House" in 1989 because his numerous commercial endorsements didn't fit the image of public television, his WGBH producers said at the time.

"Home Again" is sponsored by Sears, and Vila is a spokesman for Sears Craftsman Tools. But he said he does not see the arrangement as a conflict of interest.

"Sears has never told us we have to use only their products," he said. "If a carpenter comes on a job and he's got Black & Decker tools, I'm not going to tell him he can't use them. I'm not trying to be a censor. We do use Sears building products when it makes sense, but it's not a requirement."

Vila admitted, however, that he has been guilty of hiding Japanese-made Mikita tools from the camera.

"They have a distinctive teal color," he said. "My son has called me down for it, though, and I'm trying not to do it any more."

"Home Again," which restores two houses each season, is seen on more than 130 stations. The first

Wheel of Fortune comes to Soviet Union

MOSCOW (AP) — She fumbles the plastic letters. She doesn't walk like a star. And she never heard of Vanna White.

But like Vanna, Natasha Chistyakova has her fans. She is the letter lady on "Magic Field," the Soviet Union's copy of the American TV game show "Wheel of Fortune."

"Magic" is far from the staid, doctrinaire fare that dominated state-run television. Glasnost and the switch to a free-market economy have resulted in 50 minutes of Hollywood-style glitter, smiles and commercials.

"But it is not the only game show in town. Others on TV here include 'What, Where and When?,' 'Club of the Witty and Jolly,' a Soviet version of 'The Dating Game' entitled 'Find me,' and a Soviet video adaptation of the board game 'Trivial Pursuit.'"

The non-game TV fare includes PBS' "Adam Smith's Money World," dubbed in Russian; "Adam's Apple," a program for men that has featured topless women; and "Walney Presents," featuring the best of Mickey, Donald and Goofy.

"Magic Field," which only airs on Tuesday

nights, and in prime time, is less flashy and has a slower-moving wheel than its American cousin. But it's more colorful and upbeat than other Soviet TV shows. Everyone seems to be smiling.

Not quite the same "lots of cash and an assortment of fabulous and exciting prizes" that "Wheel" offers, "Magic Field" does tantalize with Soviet-style treasures: hard-to-buy items such as vacuum cleaners and cars.

Chistyakova, the letter lady, is a slender blonde who wears a tight black miniskirt and sparkling white blouse. During a recent taping, she dropped a pile of plastic letters and walked on the set without the elegance of her American counterpart.

When she's not on the set at the Ostankino Soviet TV studios in north Moscow, the 22-year-old is in a booth editing the program or studying French at Moscow State University.

Unlike her American counterpart, who gets equal billing with host Pat Sajak, Natasha does not even get introduced. Her name appears only in the ending credits, listed only as an editor.

And she only earns what Vanna White might consider spare change — 200 rubles a month

(\$320) and a royalty of \$40 a show. Vladislav Listiev, a witty former journalist, is her on-air partner — the Soviet Pat Sajak, if you can imagine a mustachioed, brown-haired Sajak. "Magic Field" is not his wheel of fortune, either. He earns just \$592 a month.

"I am very rich person," he sarcastically says. "So rich I have to live in a hotel."

Despite the obvious similarities with the "Wheel of Fortune," Listiev insists he has never seen the American program and traces "Magic Field" to the children's game "Hangman."

With a once-taboo combination of commercialism and capitalism, the show manages to offer highly coveted items in this consumer's wasteland of shortages. One recent show ended with a contestant winning a bottle of perfume and a samovar, a Russian urn for brewing tea.

The show receives 2,000 letters a day from fans and applicants to be contestants.

One contestant was so eager she called show administrator Julia Logovaya and offered her about \$7,500 and a house on the beach if she put him on as a contestant. The offer and its maker were turned down.

Promotional push for big hit 'Home Alone' unprecedented for new film on videocassette

From the folks who brought you "Top Gun" and "E.T.," comes the next hot video title, "Home Alone," due in stores Aug. 22 and priced at \$24.98.

The folks in question, however, are not the movie studios. We're talking about Pepsi, the soft-drink company that put its commercials on those cassettes and, for "E.T.," further induced buyers with a \$5 rebate program. The rebate for "Home Alone" — obtained by mailing in the torn packaged-with the cassette, the video proof-of-purchase tab and a Pepsi proof-of-purchase — brings the price to \$19.98. The offer will expire on Jan. 31, 1992.

This effort is part of a promotional push by Pepsi, American Airlines and Fox Video that, at \$25 million, is unprecedented for a new film on videocassette.

"Home Alone," the movie about spunky 10-year-old Kevin McCallister (played by Macaulay Culkin), who defends the family homestead against two bungling burglars, was a surprise sensation at the box office last year and is still playing in theaters. Its theatrical take of \$268 million makes it the third-highest-grossing movie of all time, behind "E.T." — "The Extraterrestrial" (\$399.8 million) and "Star Wars" (\$322 million).

But it's not so surprising that Pepsi has made promotion of the Fox Video cassette the culmination of its season-long "Summer Chill Out" campaign. A Pepsi commercial starting in August will advertise the rebate, and coupons for freecopies of the video will be randomly inserted in 24-pack cases of Pepsi brand soft drinks.

"Home Alone" will be the first major video title to benefit from two sponsors. American Airlines, whose name appears prominently in the movie as the airline on which Kevin's family is flying to Paris, will get a 10-second promotional spot before the Pepsi commercial.

In the cassette will be a coupon redeemable through American for a discount adult round-trip air fare, both domestic and international. (A second proof-of-purchase tab for this second sponsor will be on the cassette.) The amount of the discount varies according to the ticket price, with the highest being \$100 off a normal fare of \$700 or more, and the minimum \$35 off a fare of at least \$199.

SKIPPING OR NON-SPANKING?

'Wild Hearts' offers bland family fare

HOLLYWOOD—The name of the film is "Wild Hearts Can't Be Broken," and that's also the message of the film.

Sonora Webster (Gabrielle Anwar), an orphan growing up in Depression-era Georgia, dishes her uncutting spirit and joins up with a traveling stunt show as a diving horse girl. From a height of 40 feet, she bristles at galloping horses and plunges into a tank of water. Maybe her past can't be broken, but her neck seems to be in constant jeopardy, or to mention the horse's name.

Sonora's diving leads to a mishap, at which point the film, which has been puttering along in the bland, sentimental family fare mode, suddenly turns very inspirational. The real-life Sonora, an Atlantic City, N.J., headliner in her day, must have had a grand old time, and Gabrielle Anwar tries to live that thing up with some, er, um, of her own. She never gets too tomboyish, though; the film makers have been careful to provide Sonora with an adoring squire (Michael Schoeffling), the son of the embittered grouch (Cliff Robertson) who owns the traveling show. Robertson is the only real threat in the film, although his benevolent tasking job recalls Lon Chaney Jr. in his first stage as the Wolfman.

It should be noted that, although a mechanical horse was used for the diving sequences, the film doesn't go out of its way to condemn a stunt that is still not unimportant in its own right. The film's value, like the horse's, gets about shirt. The implication is that they'll be diving it a safe way for the film makers to glorify Sonora's "heroism."

As one of the new current G-rated movies in captivity, Disney's "Wild Hearts" is a bit too moony for the kiddies and a bit too smug for the teens. It is a waste to transport the film to television, no doubt, will be the Disney Channel.

"It's a skit about a guy skiing in an emergency rescue suit," he said. "As he passes the camera, it's that something it gets magnetized."

The comedy skit was filmed on Snow Summit in California and previewed in Los Angeles. Audiences loved it and it was included in the Warren Miller film "Warren Miller's Best of the Best."

Butterfield found he could leave the sound elements of filmmaking to others. Kim Schneider, one of Warren Miller's best editors, collaborates with him on many ski shoots.

Butterfield concentrates on capturing great visuals; Schneider edits the footage to match the music or narration soundtrack.

"Kim is very good with music. I can't hear it, of course, so I rely on him a lot," he said.

Last year, two Butterfield segments edited by Schneider were included in the Warren Miller film "Extreme Winter." One featured the wacky Vaumettes comedy quartet in a music video filmed in Sun Valley. The Vaumettes sing their song "Vaumette Daze" while riding the freyhawk Quad ski lift performing the concert at the base of the Warm Springs lifts.

The second Butterfield segment, also filmed on Baldy, was classic Warren Miller footage: fast action, clever stunts, great skiing and creative photography.

Titled "Sun Valley Bumps," the segment was filmed by Butterfield on Upper River Run and Upper Holiday moguls. A trio of local mogul musers attacks the mountain while the camera follows behind them, tracking their skis through the bumps.

The weeklong shoot will probably be edited down to less than a minute of screen time in the 42nd Warren Miller ski film, "Born to Ski," due to be released in October.

Being a deaf cameraman has certain advantages. Butterfield said, "I'm not distracted by the sound of things. Because of that, I think I get a much richer look than I would otherwise."

But deafness is a serious handicap to a cameraman whose ambition is to direct and produce his own feature films. Those positions require a mastery of all the elements of filmmaking, not just the visual picture.

After six years of total deafness, Butterfield reluctantly agreed to a cochlear implant operation in 1988. He was skeptical about the effectiveness of the new treatment, but an NBC television program on medical breakthroughs offered a swap. If Butterfield would allow himself to be filmed before, during and after the operation, the network would pay the costs.

"For somebody who could once hear, it's a Godsend," he said of the operation, which implants electrodes in the ear to receive sound from a hearing aid and transmit it directly to the brain. The implant allows him to interact one-on-one with the hearing world, and telephone conversations are once again possible.

Butterfield now interacts with both communities, the hearing and the deaf. He has produced programs for the Silent Network Satellite Service and is negotiating on a series of programs for America's Disability Channel. At the same time, he creates

commercials, instructional videos and documentaries for mainstream audiences.

Current projects include a 90-minute feature on the history of Sun Valley to be released soon, and documentary footage on the plight of the salmon in the Pacific Northwest.

"I do have regrets about not being able to go to film school," Butterfield admitted. "It would mean having complete mental control of all the elements of filmmaking from interior lighting to the jargon people use on the set. As it is, I can't share that."

What Butterfield has learned of filmmaking was gained by observing and practicing. Aside from a couple of 8mm film classes in college, he has no formal training. He continues to learn with each project, hoping to keep up with new technologies while making a living at his craft.

"My goal is to be able, one day, to dream up, build, execute and deliver documentaries from scratch. I want to be able to take an idea and see it through to the end, to the laugh or the tear."

Rose to play Ty Cobb in TV movie

In yet another case of art imitating life, Pete Rose is going to play Ty Cobb in a made-for-TV movie entitled "The Babe Ruth Story."

That was some casting: Having one of the meanest and most talented players ever to lace up baseball spikes portrayed by one of the meanest and most talented players to follow in his footsteps.

"It's something that just came in out of the blue," said Cal Levy, the partner at Hamilton Projects in Cincinnati who handles Rose. "It's not a huge role or anything, so they must have figured they didn't need a name actor to play the part."

"And you have to admit," he added, "it is a nice twist on things."

More restless even than the legendary "Georgia Peach," Rose pursued Cobb's seemingly untouchable career-hit record across the ages until he collected No. 4,192 off Padres pitcher Eric Show in September 1985.

Most notable — he accomplished after that was to get himself in a lot of trouble with both major league baseball and the federal government.

Rose could not be reached for comment Thursday about his latest project. And though Levy doubted he had much experience in this kind of thing — "No school plays or anything like that so far as I know," he said — Rose

is off to a promising start.

His speech at a luncheon to raise money for a Cincinnati-area boys' club where he is working off part of his debt to society was well received, and he has shown some promise as a fill-in sportscaster during two appearances on the local news. On top of which, generating enthusiasm for the role will certainly not be a problem, not for a guy who dove into everything head-first. In fact, the only acting stretch Rose is likely to have to make for the movie is sliding into bases feet-first.

Jazz ticket holders protest higher prices

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Utah Jazz employees are breaking the news to season-ticket holders that most of them will have to pay substantially more for seats in the new arena than they did at the Salt Palace.

While there have been cries of anguish, Nola Wayman, director of the club's Customer Service Center, said that so far only one customer has canceled.

For most of the 11,300 season ticket holders, the price of their seats will rise dramatically when the team moves into its new building for the 1991-92 season.

The price range for Jazz tickets will look much the same in 1991-92 as it did last season — from an \$8 low to a \$40 high the first year; in the new building, as compared to the \$8-to-\$37.50 range of last season.

However, within that \$8-to-\$40 range, the number of seats in the three highest price categories will almost double.

Gambling brouhaha doesn't threaten Tarkanian's future

LAS VEGAS (AP) — A UNLV official said the current flap over photos showing three former Runnin' Rebels players with a convicted gambler is not enough to cost basketball coach Jerry Tarkanian his job.

A clause in Tarkanian's contract calls for automatic dismissal only in the event of a link between him and a major NCAA violation.

Interim athletic director Dennis Finfrock said that while school officials don't like what has happened, they hope there will be no further problems. He said the contact with the players and Richard "The Fixer" Perry is being investigated.

Finfrock said Thursday he had met with Tarkanian "two or three times" this week and Perry was discussed "at least two different times."

"Jerry's contract has not come up," Finfrock said.

Tarkanian's current contract runs for two more seasons. He must be notified by July 1 whether it will be renewed past that point for another three seasons.

UNLV has been under a court order preventing Tarkanian's firing since the school was placed on probation for recruiting violations in 1977.

The NCAA ordered Tarkanian suspended for two years under the same penalty, but he went to court and obtained an injunction preventing his suspension. That injunction remains in effect.


Finfrock said the photos themselves were not enough to be considered a major violation that could lead to Tarkanian's dismissal, but added "we have a lot of questions that are unanswered" regarding Perry.

"Day-by-day we keep getting harried by more negative publicity, more on Perry," Finfrock said. "Facts will have to control the whole situation. Rumor and innuendo can't."

"None of us likes the situation we're in. Jerry doesn't like it and we certainly don't like it. We're getting negative publicity across the country and around the world."

"Reputation and integrity are important and those are in jeopardy when the appearance of any contact with a sports gambler is brought forward." We're working hard and fast to get to the bottom of this."



Cover story

Awards to celebrate high profile year

Although Broadway may have seen better days critically and financially, this has been a banner year for bizarre headlines involving the season's plays and musicals, many of which are nominees in "The 45th Annual Tony Awards." The gala airs live Sunday, June 2, on CBS. Jeremy Pross and Julie Andrews host.

Take "Miss Saigon," which is up for Best Musical and whose leads, Jonathan Pryce and Lea Salonga, are nominees for Best Performance by a Leading Actor and Actress in a Musical. In fact, this updating of "Madame Butterfly" is tied for most Tony nominations (11) with "The Will Rogers Follies."

But what most people primarily associate with "Miss Saigon" is less artistic excellence than the political firestorm it kindled when producer Cameron Mackintosh insisted that Pryce, who played the conniving Eurasian pimp in the original London production, star in the Broadway version as well. Many in the acting and Asian-American communities protested that the role should have gone to an actor of Asian extraction, but Mackintosh won the showdown after he threatened not to bring the show to Broadway at all if Pryce was excluded. Protest continues, however, not over Pryce's involvement, but over the portrayal of Asians in the musical. This may seem contradictory — if the role is so offensive, why would protestors want an Asian actor to play it? — but show people are special people.

Another special person is David Hampton, who was arrested in 1983 after posing as Sidney Poitier's son and duping a number of prominent New Yorkers into serving as his host. Playwright John Guare based his "Six Degrees of Separation" — nominated

for a Best Play Tony — on Hampton's scam. Hampton now plans to sue Guare, explaining to a New York City newspaper, "He (Guare) stole my life. The least he can do is give me a few dollars." Guare claims that Hampton has been making telephone threats against him.

Guare's fellow Tony-nominee playwright Neil Simon might be tempted to make a few midnight calls himself. Simon's "Lost in Yonkers" is not only nominated for a Tony; it also won a Pulitzer Prize. Can an actor win a Daytime Emmy for a character who is finally growing up? That could happen Thursday, June 27 (9 p.m.-11 p.m., ET).

on the 18th Annual Daytime Emmy Awards with host Bob Barker via CBS.

Burnett returns in CBS lineup for fall

NEW YORK (AP) — Carol Burnett, who spent 12 seasons on CBS with her one-hour comedy-variety series, is returning with a new series next fall; the network said Friday. The schedule also adds six other new series.

The schedule also adds a Saturday night movie to the CBS lineup, and features another blast from the past — former NBC "Sanford and Son" star Redd Foxx, who will co-star in a new sitcom, "The Royal Family."

Senior CBS officials said the network is on the rebound from its four-season stay in third place in prime time ratings. One predicted that the network will be in first place next season.

"I think we have the schedule and pieces to be number one next year, and I'll be disappointed if we're not," CBS Entertainment president Jeff Sagansky said at a news conference held at the CBS Broadcast Center here.

The new series on CBS are four comedies, the one-hour "The Carol

Burnett Show," and two dramas. Shows dropped to make-for-them include "Guns of Paradise," "The Antagonists" and the costly fantasy show, "The Flash."

Burnett, whose CBS series ended in 1979, decamped to NBC last year with a half-hour comedy anthology series, "Carol & Company," that began in March 1990 and was renewed for the next season. It got respectable ratings.

Sagansky said negotiations to bring her back to CBS began after the network heard six weeks ago that she planned to change her show's format back to an comedy-variety show.

"We started to hear rumors, which we couldn't believe, that NBC was unsure as to where they were going to schedule it," he said.

In Fox's new series, he plays an Atlanta mailman who, with his wife, played by Della Reese, are planning to retire. That changes when their daughter and her three children move in with them.

The other new sitcoms are "Teach," starring Phill — with two Ls — Lewis as a young, black music teacher at an exclusive white boys'

boarding school, "Princess," starring Julie Hagerty, Fran Drescher and Twiggy Lawson as three young women sharing a rent-free New York penthouse, and "Brooklyn Bridge," a comedy-drama about family life in Brooklyn in 1956.

The two one-hour dramas are "Palace Guard," starring D.W. Moffett as a master hotel thief who now is head of security for an international hotel chain, and "P.S.: I Love You."

The last stars Connie Sellecca as a beautiful con artist and Greg Evigan as a New York cop. The two are forced to pose as a married couple under a witness protection program.

CBS' addition of a Saturday movie night gives it three. It currently has movies on Tuesday and Sunday.

The network also moved its well-received "The Trials of Rosie O'Neill" from Mondays to Thursday nights.

It said its backup series for shows that falter next season include "Family Dog," a half-hour cartoon series from Steven Spielberg, and "Tequila and Boner," an action-comedy starring Rick Rossovich.

NBC to launch news channel

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC News plans to start an overnight news service, complete with anchors, that will provide up to 4½ hours of news programming in predawn hours for its 209 affiliates, the network said Thursday.

NBC, which now stops broadcasting after "Later With Bob Costas" and doesn't resume until "NBC News at Sunrise," said it plans to start the new service late this year.

No anchors for the predawn newscasts have been named yet.

The new weeknight operation, will be based in Charlotte, N.C., and operated by the network's NBC News Channel, a Charlotte-based news service for NBC affiliates that began operations there in January.

Official declares that GE will stand firm with NBC

NEW YORK (AP) — Despite rumors, General Electric has no plans to sell its NBC Inc. subsidiary, the broadcast company's chief executive told a gathering of NBC network affiliates Thursday.

"I can't imagine any new owner being as willing to support us as GE has demonstrated every day of the week," NBC Inc. President Robert C. Wright said.

Industry rumors have flown in recent months that GE would sell the less-profitable broadcast company and Paramount Studios was ready to buy it.

Wright, in a speech delivered in a session closed to reporters, also denied speculation that the parent company was tightening its purse strings as the recession has cut deeply into network revenues.

"As the business began to soften and our ratings cooled, GE gave us its checkbook and support to do what we thought was necessary to maintain our success," Wright said.

"If we fail to meet our objectives, the blame falls squarely on my shoulders and those of us at NBC," he added. "We run the network, make the choices and spend the money."

Later, President Bush put in a surprise appearance via closed-

circuit television before a gathering of NBC affiliates and advertisers at Carnegie Hall.

Bush said he wants to sign a good civil rights bill this year, and characterized one his administration has sent to Congress as "a good, strong proposal" that "copes with discrimination in the workplace."

But that bill is being held up, Bush said, "while Congress, abetted by some powerful groups, pushes a bill that is almost identical to one I vetoed last year."

On other subjects, Wright praised former NBC Entertainment chief Brandon Tartikoff, credited with much of NBC's ratings success, who quit the network to head Paramount Studios.

"Is there life after Brandon Tartikoff? Yes, there certainly is," Wright said. "We are going to miss him. Yet, as he has said himself, he is only one person in a programming department of many talented people."

Later, in a news briefing, NBC Television Network President Pier Mapes and affiliates board chairman Eric Bremner, president of Seattle-based King Broadcasting Co., discussed other issues from the affiliates meeting.

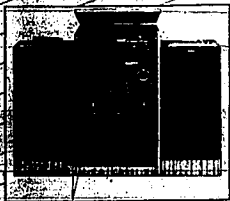
