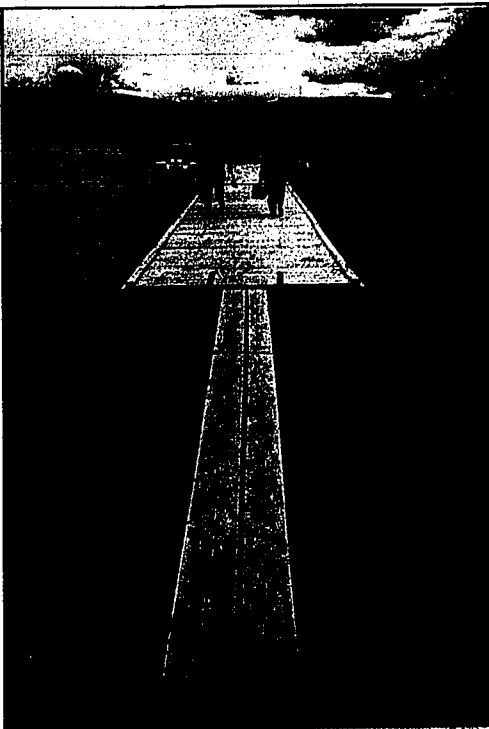

## Dry times aren't fading for higher elevations

TWIN FALLS — For most of the Magic Valley, the big dry has disappeared in the big chill.

A wetter-than-normal spring combined with a cooler-than-usual June has some valley water users close to forgetting the drought of '91.

But for the highlanders of south-central Idaho, the D-word is dying hard.

Magic Reservoir, where the Wood River Canal Co. stores its water, holds a little more than 10 percent of its capacity. Salmon Falls Creek Reservoir and Oakley Reservoir have 19 percent each.

"The cool weather has kept demand down, which has helped, but it's also kind of hurt because it's slowed the melting of the snowpack," said Dick Onaida, manager of the Wood River Canal Co.

Ironically, that's a formula that spells relief for the rest of the Magic Valley.

"In terms of what it was earlier and what people were predicting for this summer, we're in pretty good shape," said Earl Corless of the Bureau of Reclamation's Minidoka Project office in Burley. "Whenever you start predicting what Mother Nature is going to do, you're always going to be in trouble."

Although June hasn't been much

## Charboneau could face death sentence under court ruling

BOISE — The U.S. Supreme Court on Thursday removed one of the obstacles standing between convicted murderer Jaime Charboneau and a death sentence.

Idaho prosecutors won a major victory when the high court reversed two recent decisions and upheld the use of victim-impact statements in the sentencing phase of death penalty cases.

In rejecting a 1986 death sentence for Charboneau, the Idaho Supreme Court ruled that victim-impact statements presented at his sentencing hearing were improper. The U.S. Supreme Court refused to reinstate that sentence in 1989.

Charboneau, 37, was convicted of the 1984 shooting of his former wife, Marilyn Arbaugh at her farm near Jerome. A resentencing hearing is scheduled for October.

Thursday's decision "completely reversed the direction in a significant number of our cases," state Solicitor General Lynn Thomas told The Associated Press. "This certainly undoes a lot of

confusion, a lot of hyper-technicalism, in these cases."

The court voted 6-3 to permit accounts of a murder victim's character and the relatives during sentencing in capital cases.

The decision came as no surprise to Charboneau's defense attorney, Jerome County Public Defender M. Lynn Dunlap.

"We knew, given the present court, that this could happen and we've talked about it," Dunlap said. "In fact, we began preparing for this eventuality a few months ago."

The victim-impact statement issue was only one of several things that led to Charboneau's sentence being overturned, Dunlap said.

"It will certainly change our strategy," he said.

## Successor for Marshall difficult choice for Bush

WASHINGTON — In farewell dissent, retired Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall missed a liberal complaint against conservative judgments — a protest that points to the problems President Bush now faces in choosing his successor.

Bush's second appointment to the high court will reinforce the trend toward the right, and it will have to gain approval of a Democratic Senate next fall, just before the president begins his re-election campaign.

And there are more complexities to be confronted in the nomination.

Bush will be naming a replacement for the first black justice — at a time that he's already at odds with the civil rights lobby for his threat to once again veto a job discrimination bill he insists would lead to a quota system.

### Analysis

And the court may confront the basic question of abortion rights before the 1992 election.

All of that means that there will be no easy confirmation route in the Senate.

When Justice David H. Souter was confirmed last fall, influential Senate Democrats sought to make him a benchmark, telling Bush that they would fight the nomination of anyone markedly more conservative.

Only nine liberal Democrats voted against Souter, saying they feared he would tip the court toward reversal of the 1973 decision that legalized abortion.

He would discuss the prospect at his confirmation hearing, and hasn't signed a quota system.

## Yugoslavs, Slovenes clash

LJUBLJANA, Yugoslavia (AP) — Yugoslav federal troops fighting to hold the nation together battled Slovenian secessionists Thursday in at least 20 skirmishes, using helicopters, tanks and grenades.

Casualty figures varied widely, but one official spoke of as many as 100 dead and wounded.

Slovenian Defense Minister Janez Jansa said his troops shot down at least six federal air force helicopters on the first day of open warfare since Slovenia and the neighboring republic of Croatia declared independence on Tuesday.

Jansa said 100 had been killed or injured in Slovenia. Other Slovenian sources, however, reported only six deaths and about 20 wounded.

The federal government also sent tanks into Croatia, and two were hurt

when an armored vehicle crushed their car, the Interior Ministry reported. Federal government tanks sliced through roadblocks erected by secessionists. Life remained normal in many areas, but tension was high throughout the nation.

The violence followed months of political conflict among Yugoslavia's six republics, whose unity has been damaged by ethnic and political feuds.

Slovenia and Croatia — despite warnings that secession could provoke a civil war — went ahead with planned declarations of independence.

— after failing to get the central government to agree to a looser federation.

On Thursday, the federal army sought to cut off Slovenia — and possibly also Croatia — from the outside and demonstrate that they remain part of the federation.

## Twin Falls prosecutor Baxter won't seek re-election

TWIN FALLS — Eight is enough for Twin Falls County Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter, who said Thursday she will not run for re-election next year.

"The job is over," Baxter said. "I will have been here 8 1/2 years when my term expires and I think that's enough."

Deputy Prosecutor Frank Nichols, who handles the office's drug cases, is interested in running for the job, Baxter said.

"I think I made it pretty clear last time I ran that this would be my last term," Baxter

said, but people have been trying to change her mind for the past 3 1/2 years.

Baxter, whose term expires at the end of 1992, said she has made no professional plans yet.

"I don't want to think about it too much because I think people who do that develop a real short timer's attitude," she said. "I want to do the

best job I can in my last year and a half."

Baxter, 35, said she intends to stay in Twin Falls, where her husband Bill is a certified public accountant.

"I'm going to have a personal, private offer to join private law firms, but Baxter said she isn't ready to make commitments about her professional future.

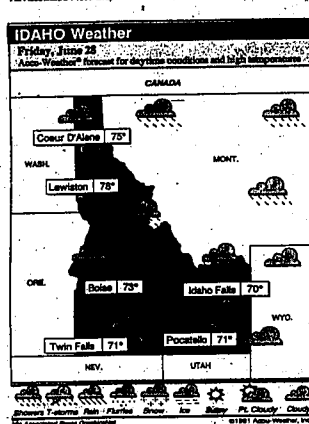
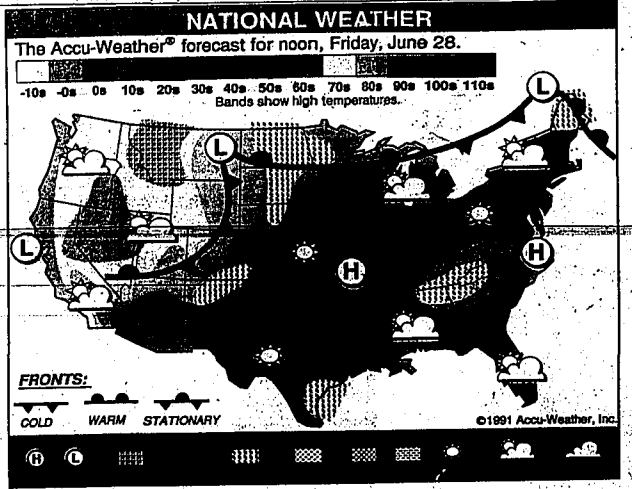
Baxter was first elected to the position in 1984, when she beat two contenders in the Republican and primary and faced no Democratic opposition in the general election. She was reelected in 1988.

She was responsible for forming the county's first-ever grand jury in 1987, a move that sparked public controversy, especially when the initial indictments returned on 21 drug suspects were rejected because of flawed jury-selection procedures.

Baxter persevered, however, and empaneled a new grand jury once updated jury-selection procedures were in place.

Since being elected, Baxter has made a special effort to fight child abuse in Twin Falls County. She formed a special team of authorities to handle abuse investigations and spearheaded the drive to create a special interview room for abused children.

Midwest, Southeast hammered by hail, thunderstorms

High wind, rain, hail and thunderstorms hit the Midwest and Southeast Thursday, while summer remained a no-show in Northern California.

A tornado touched down briefly in Houma, La. There were no reports of injuries or damage, the National Weather Service said. Thunderstorms with wind gusting to near 60 mph were reported in Houghton, Mich., downing trees. Three-quarter-inch hail fell in Grand Marais, Mich.

At midday, rain and thunderstorms stretched from Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, the Texas gulf coast, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Nevada, California, Tennessee, Georgia and South Carolina.

Hot weather advisories were posted in parts of Illinois, with afternoon temperatures had reached near 90 degrees with high humidity, creating a heat index of near 100 degrees.

**Compromise effort may be at end**

WASHINGTON — The leader of moderate Republicans seeking a compromise civil rights bill said Thursday that his effort is over unless the White House shows some flexibility.

Sen. John Danforth, R-Mo., said his group had moved "90 percent to the administration" view but that White House Chief of Staff John Sununu wanted more.

"We have made a major effort to reach out to the administration" during the past few weeks, he said. "I hope the administration can reach back a little bit."

Judy Smith, deputy White House press secretary, said, "We're not giving up."

**Senate votes for tough sentences**

WASHINGTON — The Senate voted Thursday to impose 10-year sentences on criminals who carry guns while committing serious crimes and 20-year sentences to those convicted of firing their weapons at victims.

The amendment to the crime bill under debate in the Senate would make it a federal crime to carry or use a gun to commit a violent felony or drug crime.

Approved on an 88-11 vote, the amendment was introduced by Sen. Alfonse D'Amato, R-N.Y.

D'Amato also requested an amendment the Senate adopted Wednesday to make it a federal crime punishable by death to commit a violent crime with a sold interstate commerce. The death-penalty provision would apply even in states where there is no capital punishment, such as D'Amato's home state of New York.

**Base closing decisions start today**

WASHINGTON — A government commission will begin making decisions Friday on what military bases will close as part of the effort to hold the defense budget in check.

Former New Jersey Rep. Jim Courter, chairman of the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission, said the panel would begin with the bases on which it has already reached general agreement.

The more controversial issues will wait until Sunday.

The commission is required to submit its report to Congress and President Bush on Monday.

**South Africa scraps apartheid laws**

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — The last major laws segregating South Africa by race and limiting land ownership by blacks were scrapped Thursday.

President F.W. de Klerk signed bills repealing apartheid legislation and setting up a commission to investigate political violence and intimidation. One bill would make it more difficult for security forces to hold people indefinitely without filing charges.

De Klerk signed a total of 45 bills at a ceremony in Pretoria, including the legislation scrapping apartheid laws that was passed in a historic session of Parliament that ended last week.

The laws that were repealed included the pillars of the racial system of apartheid: the Group Areas and Land Use Acts that segregated residential areas and limited land ownership by blacks, and the Population Registration Act, which classified citizens by race.

**U.N. warns Iraq on inspection delays**

UNITED NATIONS — The Security Council president warned the Iraqi ambassador Thursday about delays in allowing nuclear inspectors to demand assurances that Iraq would cooperate with U.N. weapons investigations.

"I delivered a message for his government very clearly, — there was no way to have a mistake" in understanding it, President M. Jean-Jacques Bechto told reporters later.

Bechto, the Ivory Coast ambassador, declined to elaborate. Details of the meeting were not disclosed.

In Paris, America's U.N. ambassador, Thomas Pickering, said Iraq could face renewed world wrath if it continued to reject inspections for nuclear material.

Iraq's U.N. Ambassador Abdul Amir al-Anbani would say only that he expected a response.

Charbonneau's resentencing, is on sabbatical and was unavailable for comment Thursday.

The last of several motions leading up to Charbonneau's resentencing hearing are set to wrap up Aug. 7 in Jerome. The resentencing hearing is set for Oct. 7.

Thursday's ruling could change those dates because a hearing that includes victim-impact statements may take longer than three days, Dunlap said.

The earlier decisions overturned by the court's ruling had been the basis for the Idaho Supreme Court's voiding the death sentences in the cases of Lacey Sivak and Charles Fain as well as Charbonneau's. The basis for the pending appeals of up to 10 of the other 18 inmates on Idaho's Death Row.

Sivak, convicted of 1981 shooting death of a gasoline station attendant, awaits resentencing. Fain, convicted of the 1993 sexual assault and murder of a 9-year-old girl, has already been resentenced to death.

Twin Falls County Prosecutor K. Ellen Baxter called the ruling "a good win for prosecutors."

"It seemed somehow illogical that judges could consider the impact on the victim in other cases, but not capital cases," Baxter said.

As usual for most of southern Idaho, the great equalizer for water users has been the April-like temperatures.

"It's been much cooler than normal," said Bill Galan of the National Weather Service's Kimberly station. "We've only had eight days of 80 degrees or higher and our high of the month has been 87."

The result is that a few days shy of the Fourth of July, the Snake River Basin still has plenty of snowpack in the bank.

"The main thing that helped us this spring was that it decreased spring drawdown by a large amount," said Corless. "We're seeing consistently at 90 percent of most of our major reservoirs."

The giants of the Minidoka Project — American Falls and Palisades reservoirs and Jackson Lake — collectively have 3.4 million acre feet of water in storage, 92 percent of capacity. As a whole the Upper Snake River system is 92 percent full.

But that water is coming from the Tetons and the Rockies, and isn't doing the irrigators of the Wood River drainage much good.

"I'm excited about hanging on," Oneida said. "We're hoping to hang on until the 10th of July."

That question will be raised again, more sharply and more persistently, when Bush's nominee to succeed Marshall goes before the Senate Judiciary Committee.

The Democrats who favor abortion rights know they won't get a nominee who thinks their way. "I know that and we all know that," said Sen. Joseph R. Biden, D-Del., when Souter was confirmed.

But the Democratic majority would balk at a nominee openly committed to overturning the abortion decision.

Souter came with his nomination with few published writings and no major decisions involving the contentious issues awaiting the court. So his confirmation hearings dealt in general terms with qualifications, judicial temperament, philosophy.

On the high court, he has proven to be the cautious conservative he seemed from the start. He has ruled against criminal law cases, he has ruled against defendants, siding with them only twice.

One case, permitting the use of victim impact evidence in sentencing for a murder, nearly drew Marshall's dissent on Thursday, just before he announced his re-appointment at 82.

Souter joined a majority in a ruling Marshall called radical. Marshall said it "seems a clear sign that the acres of established constitutional liberties are now ripe

on the Supreme Court, a position that at the least would be awkward to take for a president running for reelection," wrote Sheldon Goldman, professor of political science at the University of Massachusetts.

With Bush's second nomination, he and Ronald Reagan will have chosen a majority of the justices — Sandra Day O'Connor, Antonin Scalia, Anthony M. Kennedy, Souter and the new justice.

"That pendulum swings," Justice Harry A. Blackmun said in a 1990 interview, commenting on the turn toward the right, away from his liberal bloc. "It will say that way now for 40 or 50 years, I'm sure."

**Bank regulator: Funds dwindling fast**

WASHINGTON — A senior regulator warned Thursday the fund protecting bank deposits is dwindling faster than previously thought, lending urgency to the House Banking Committee's work on a sweeping overhaul of the financial system.

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. Chairman L. William Seidman said the agency may need additional taxpayer-backed borrowing authority as soon as late this year.

He told the House Budget Committee the insurance fund lost another \$1.3 billion during the first three months of this year, slipping to \$7.1 billion.

**Schwarzkopf will retire with 4 stars**

WASHINGTON — President Bush formally nominated Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, the commander of U.S. forces in the Persian Gulf War, for retirement in his current grade of four-star general, the Pentagon announced Thursday.

Schwarzkopf, commander of U.S. Central Command, which is responsible for U.S. operations in the Middle East, is scheduled to retire from the Army on Aug. 31.

His retirement, like that of all general officers, must be approved by the Senate.

Schwarzkopf, who will be 57 years old on Aug. 22, has served 34 years in the Army and has been commander of Central Command since November 1988. A change-of-command ceremony is scheduled for Aug. 9 at Central Command headquarters at MacDill Air Force Base, Fla.

**Researchers find genetic chain link**

BOSTON — Scientists have discovered another link in the genetic chain reaction that controls inflammation as the body responds to infections.

Researchers already know of one important gene that directly causes inflammation. Now, they have located another gene that turns that gene off, preventing runaway responses to microbes.

"It's clear this is a major factor involved in regulating inflammatory genes, but it's not the only one," said Dr. J. Stephen Haskill. "It's a specific piece of a very large puzzle."

Haskill, a researcher at the University of North Carolina, said the finding could improve understanding, and perhaps eventually treating, diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis that involve chronic inflammation.

It could also aid the design of anti-inflammatory drugs by providing researchers with a specific genetic target for their medications.

**Lyme disease finally becoming stable**

ATLANTA — Lyme disease, the widely publicized tick-borne ailment, appears to have leveled off in the United States at about 8,000 cases a year, federal health officials said Thursday.

But researchers said that with the vagaries in reporting of the relatively new disease, it's hard to tell if its spread really has stopped.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control said 7,997 cases of Lyme disease were reported nationwide last year, down 9 percent from 8,803 cases in 1989.

The drop is somewhat surprising, since Lyme disease cases nearly doubled each year from 1986 through 1989.

"Whether this is a plateau, or just a temporary stop along the way-side, is hard to say," said Dr. Roy Campbell, a Lyme disease specialist with the CDC.

**Drug bust can mean life terms**

WASHINGTON (AP) — States may impose life in prison without parole for people convicted of possessing large amounts of drugs, a divided Supreme Court ruled Thursday.

The court called illegal drugs a grave threat to society.

By a 5-4 decision, the court upheld a Michigan law that makes life in prison without possibility of parole the mandatory sentence, even for first-time offenders, for possessing more than 630 grams, or 1 1/4 pounds, of cocaine.

The justices said the Michigan law — the stiffest in the nation — does not amount to "cruel and unusual punishment" banned by the Constitution's Eighth Amendment. Other states now might be encouraged to adopt similar laws in the war against drugs.

"Possession, use and distribution of illegal drugs represents one of the greatest problems affecting the health and welfare of our population," Justice Anthony M. Kennedy wrote in the court's main opinion.

He said the argument that drug trafficking is "non-violent and victimless" is "false to the point of absurdity."

"To the contrary, (the) crime threatens to cause grave harm to society," Kennedy wrote.

The decision upheld the life-without-parole prison sentence of Ronald Harmelin, 45, who had 672 grams of pure cocaine when arrested in Oak Park, a suburb of Detroit, in 1986.

In Michigan, which has no death penalty, Harmelin could not have received any more severe sentence had he been a serial killer.

"A person with a long criminal record could commit the foulest of atrocities — hacking off limbs or poking out eyes of children or attempting to assassinate public officials — without even the possibility of receiving a sentence as high as Ronnie Harmelin," his lawyer had told the justices.

Thursday's ruling did not yield a majority opinion among the justices.

Chief Justice William H. Rehnquist and Justice Antonin Scalia said the Constitution does not require a state's punishment for one crime to be proportional to its punishments for other crimes, or to other states' punishment for that crime.

**Millions may be overlooked in census**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Nearly 10 million people may have been overlooked in the 1990 census, congressional investigators said Thursday.

That's nearly double the Census Bureau's estimate, L. Nyn Stevens of the General Accounting Office told a House subcommittee.

Census-takers made 14 million errors in counting the U.S. population last year, which Stevens said were a

combination of people counted more than once and those never counted.

"The 1990 census appears to have had at least 50 percent more errors than it had in 1980," Stevens told the House Post Office and Civil Service subcommittee on census and population.

The Census Bureau's estimate was based on a survey taken shortly after the census. But the estimate doesn't include other types of errors,

such as people placed in the wrong location or infants counted even though they were born after census day. The Bush administration must decide by July 15 whether, for the first time in the history of U.S. census-taking, to replace the population count with estimates.

The deadline was set by a federal court in New York hearing a lawsuit filed by states and big cities to force a census correction.

**Parliament says no to union treaty**

MOSCOW — The Ukrainian parliament resoundingly rejected the draft Union Treaty Thursday, dashing Mikhail S. Gorbachev's hopes of completing a new unifying document for the Soviet Union by July.

The republic's parliament proposed more than 20 amendments to the treaty and sent them to committee for consideration, said Olexei Kapusta of the republic's Rukh Press agency.

The parliament decided to resume debate on its own, revised version on Sept. 15, said John Hawko, an American lawyer who watched the debate.

He said the 345-18 vote came after numerous lawmakers rejected the idea that the Soviet Union should remain as a single country.

**Israelis prevail over Muslim-captors**

SRINAGAR, India — Six Israelis, kidnapped from a houseboat and told they would be killed for being Jewish, overpowered their Kashmiri Muslim captors, officials said Thursday. One Israeli and two abductors were killed.

They said it was the last second of our lives," one of the Israelis, Koby Shnecht, said on Israel army radio in an interview from a hospital in Srinagar. "They said if we were Jews, they would have to execute us."

The Guardians of the Islamic Revolution, one of a score of Kashmiri guerrilla groups, claimed responsibility for the incident late Wednesday and accused the six Israeli men of being commandos.

**Visit to health spa ends in death for 19**

BARBOTAN-LES-THERMES, France — At least 19 cure-seekers at a health spa in southern France were killed Thursday by toxic smoke from a fire ignited when workers spilled hot tar on a rooftop.

Flames spread from the roof over a heated pool shortly before noon, said authorities in Barbotan-les-Thermes, just north of the Pyrenees mountains along the Spanish border.

The building was evacuated, and the fire was extinguished by some 80 firefighters using water from the pool.

Workers accidentally spilled a bucket of hot tar on the pool's roof, setting fire to insulation material and sending toxic black smoke into the pool area.

**Communist leader on steady course**

BANGKOK, Thailand — Do Muoi, who played a key role in Vietnam's 5-year-old economic reform program, took over as chief of the Communist Party Thursday and pledged to continue the move away from orthodox communism.

Do Muoi, who was premier before being named to the party leadership on Wednesday, also said that socialism was "the only correct path" for Vietnam, according to official media reports monitored in Bangkok.

Do Muoi, 74, succeeds Nguyen Van Linh as party general secretary. Linh, who turns 76 on next week, wanted to retire because of failing health, according to foreign diplomats.

**South Africa seeking end to isolation**

PRETORIA, South Africa — South Africa said Thursday it would sign the international nuclear non-proliferation treaty in hopes of hastening the end of its political isolation.

The decision ended years of South African resistance to joining the 1970 Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, which so far has 141 signatories.

In announcing South Africa's decision to sign on, President F.W. de Klerk cited the end of the Cold War, the resolution of conflicts in neighboring states and South Africa's warming relations with foreign countries.

**Philippines could raise rent on U.S. bases**

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — The Philippines will not soften its demands for renewal of the leases on volcano-damaged U.S. bases and might even raise the rent, an official said Thursday.

"In the light of the events, the Philippines may have to suspend the compensation (on Clark Air Base and Subic Bay naval base) because we suffered more than the Americans did," said the chief Philippine negotiator, Foreign Secretary Raul Manglapus.

"If we are to change the compensation at all, it will be to upgrade it, not reduce it," said Manglapus, who insisted scientists had assured him Mount Pinatubo's major eruptions were over.

The U.S. lease on both bases expires Sept. 16

and lease-renewal talks have bogged down over the issue of compensation. Chief U.S. negotiator Richard Armitage is scheduled to resume negotiations in Manila in about two weeks.

Before the eruptions, Manila had demanded \$825 million a year, half in trade concessions and debt relief, in return for a seven-year bases agreement. The United States had offered \$360 million for a 10- to 12-year extension.

Manglapus' tough talk Thursday came as thousands of Filipinos fled homes near the volcano after experts warned that rain could bring huge landslides. The 4,795-foot volcano, meanwhile, continued its 16-day-old eruption, shooting ash and steam as high as six miles and covering Clark

and Subic with a fresh coating of debris.

Eruptions by the volcano heavily damaged both Clark and Subic, which are 10 and 25 miles from the eruption respectively. So much ash has been blown from Mount Pinatubo that buildings on both bases have been crushed.

Communist rebels offered new peace talks to the government because of the hardships brought by the eruptions, which have killed at least 338 people since June 9 and forced thousands to flee their homes. There was no comment from President Corason Aquino on the offer, but the military announced last week it was suspending offensive operations against the insurgents in areas affected by the eruptions.

**Drug king court case hush hush**

BOGOTA, Colombia (AP) — Drug king Pablo Escobar has been telling his story to a judge sitting behind a one-way mirror for protection, but the government on Thursday refused to reveal details of the testimony.

Escobar, the 41-year-old leader of the Medellin cocaine cartel, surrendered to the government June 19 after being promised a reduced jail term and immunity from extradition to the United States.

He faces murder charges in Colombia and the United States. He also faces 14 drug and terrorism charges in Bogota alone, said Miguel Nino, the city's director of Public Order Courts.

Court authorities said earlier this week that Escobar possibly faces a maximum term of eight years.

Officials kept Escobar's testimony secret, divulging on Thursday only that he has been telling his story to a judge.

The judge, whose identity isn't known, was expected to continue questioning Escobar for weeks. Because the cocaine cartel has murdered judges in the past, the government was taking extraordinary measures to keep the judge's identity secret.

The judge listens to testimony from behind a one-way mirror and speaks into an electronic device that makes it impossible to determine whether the speaker is male or female.

The judge also keeps a jacket over his head while riding a jeep along the winding dirt road that leads to Escobar's custom-built jail in the Andes mountains.

# Craig thinks Senate will back counseling veto

Idaho

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republican Sen. Larry Craig said Thursday he will oppose House-passed legislation that includes authority for abortion counseling at taxpayer clinics should it come to a vote in the Senate.

And if the bill still reaches the White House, Craig predicted that the Senate would back President Bush if he carries out threat to veto any legislation that weakens or removes federal restrictions on abortion.

"It has on similar questions in the past," he said.

On Wednesday, Idaho's Democratic Reps. Richard Stallings and Larry LaRocco sided with the House

majority that voted 353-74 to pass the \$203 billion budget for the departments of Labor, Education and Health and Human Services. Incorporated was the amendment to overturn the administration ban on abortion counseling in taxpayer-financed clinics that had been upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court.

The abortion counseling provision was added to the bill on a voice vote as anti-abortion opponents declined to force a recorded vote in hopes of mounting the needed support to sustain the veto Bush has promised.

Tom Knappenberger, representative for LaRocco, said LaRocco has long opposed the "gag rule."

"He believes in women's right to choose, and also in women's right to have information to choose. As long as abortion remains legal in this country, women ought to have the information about it."

Stallings, who received three votes for the 1988 Democratic presidential nomination from Minnesota anti-abortion activists because of his stand, said the budgets for the three departments needed to be approved.

"There are a whole series of health programs that are absolutely essential to rural states like Idaho," Stallings said.

Even Craig acknowledged that the House action gave no clear signal

about the specific support on the abortion question.

"I can understand why Congressman Stallings voted for the whole of the bill," the senator said.

In Boise, Planned Parenthood officials applauded the House vote.

"We are elated," said Linda King White, executive director of Planned Parenthood of Idaho Inc. "This is not really about abortion. This is about freedom of speech, and fairness to poor women."

Planned Parenthood of Idaho could lose about \$38,000 in federal funds annually if it continues to discuss abortion with pregnant women. But they do not plan to stop.

## State in final fishing plea

BOISE (AP) — The state Fish and Game Commission on Thursday dispatched Commissioner Lou Racine to join Attorney General Larry EchoHawk in making a final plea to Shoshone-Bannock tribal leaders to curtail their traditional salmon harvest so the run can survive.

EchoHawk and Racine planned to meet with the tribal Business Council Friday morning on the Fort Hall Reservation, and EchoHawk predicted that if the mission fails to convince the

tribes to rein in their harvest plans the state would probably seek a federal court order to block the harvest.

An alternative discussed by the commission on Thursday would provide late season tribal fishing on the Yankee Fork of the Salmon River after the adult salmon have moved through that reach. Conley said a fence could be put up behind the adults and the tribes could fish for jacks, salmon that have returned a year early from the ocean.

## May revenue still falls shy of projection

BOISE (AP) — State revenue collections improved modestly in May on the strength of better than expected interest earnings on invested tax money.

But the Andrus administration said Thursday that with only collections for the month of June remaining in the current budget year, any likely additional rebound will still leave total receipts millions of dollars short of the amount lawmakers banked on during spending deliberations last winter.

"While this outcome will have fiscal policy ramifications for Fiscal Year 1992, there are no immediate fiscal difficulties since a cash carryover was anticipated," chief economist Michael Ferguson said.

If June receipts come in as anticipated, collections for the budget year that ends June 30 will total about \$897.7 million, just over \$7 million below the revenue estimate budget writers based their decisions on.

It will be the first time in over four years that revenues have come in below expectations.

The immediate effect of that kind of shortfall will be a reduction in the anticipated cash surplus from \$30 million to about \$23 million.

While that creates no problems in meeting the state's obligations now, the budget for the new spending year begins on Monday was based on the assumption the extra \$7 million would be available. Without it, that new budget has the potential of being at least \$15 million higher than the available cash.

Here's a potpourri of quick comments and brief barbs:

#### Jim Jones should run again

If former Attorney General Jim Jones comes about our opinion, we'd like to urge him to run for Congress.

Jones, a Magic Valley native, is one of Idaho's ablest and most principled politicians. He'd be a fine candidate to replace Rep. Richard Stallings, who is leaving the House to run for the Senate.

Jones has earned a Senate seat at least since last year's defeat by Sen. Larry Craig. But a primary challenge to Sen. Steve Symms would be bloody and divisive to Idaho's GOP.

Even if Symms retires, Jones would be money ahead to go after the 2nd District House seat, rather than battle Stallings for the Senate. A Stallings-Jones Senate race would be exciting, but it would leave the GOP with no powerhouse candidate in the 2nd District race.

Many southern Idaho voters would welcome the chance to put Jones in the House, and we think he would serve Idaho well there.

We'd like to see him run.

#### Politics and history don't mix

If you think history belongs to those who make it, you're naive. History belongs to whoever can win the ear of Congress.

At the urging of Native American activists, a House committee has approved changing the name of the Custer Battlefield National Monument to the Little Bighorn National Monument. It also approved a monument to the Indians who died at Custer's Last Stand.

A monument to Native American warriors is fine, and repainting the monument sign is no big deal. But the legislation reflects an apparent willingness by Congress to tinker with history to appease special-interest groups.

History books already are being rewritten to treat the Indian side of the story with more fairness. That's a healthy process — especially in light of scholars' ever-increasing knowledge about Custer and his hopeless battle.

But what business does Congress have getting into the act? The only history a lot of those guys care about is who contributed to their campaigns.

#### Kudos to cancer center

Congratulations to the doctors and staff of the Southern Idaho Regional

Cancer Center for an impressive first year.

Response to the center (600 patients in the first year) shows that the center's services were much needed. It also indicates that the center quickly is winning the community's confidence as a first-rate choice for cancer treatment.

Keep up the good work.

#### It's about time guys

Wow. You could knock us over with a cowcatcher.

The National Transportation Safety Board last week decided it wants first crack at "event recorders" that provide evidence about the causes of train wrecks.

The recorders are equivalent to the "black boxes" aboard jetliners. Up to now, railroad workers have examined the recorders first.

But recently, fumble-fingered railroad employees inadvertently erased parts of the recordings before the safety board could get to the data.

Fancy that. So now the board's investigators get first dibs on the recorders. Makes sense.

Our only question is, why didn't someone foresee the potential for foul-up (and abuse) before it actually happened? It didn't take a genius to see this one steaming down the track.

#### Vets deserve equal treatment

Tuesday's editorial opposing a special medal for Operation Desert Storm veterans needs clarifying.

The Bush administration already has approved a military service medal for Desert Storm vets — similar to the medals signifying service in Vietnam, Korea and the various theaters of World War II. It's called the Southwestern Asia Campaign Medal, and each Desert Storm veteran will receive one.

The medal proposed by Congressman Larry LaRocco is different. It's a commemorative medallion — Congress's way of giving a special honor to the Desert Storm warriors.

Our nomenclature was a little flawed in Tuesday's editorial, as a letter on this page points out. (Our thanks to Col. Lawrence B. Curry, Ret., for sharing his expertise.) But the basic point still stands: No matter how proud the country may be of the Desert Storm participants, giving them a special honor beyond what previous wars' veterans received is a bad idea.

It's a break with military tradition for a cynically political purpose.



## Like others, Sununu was ripe for fall

When Harry S. Truman was president, he presided at the daily staff meetings.

His successor, Dwight D. Eisenhower, decided to have a White House chief of staff. And as federal power has become concentrated in the White House, it's become one of the most powerful posts in government.

Still, it's a staff job, the primary task of which was once described as "keeping the workload of government away from the president's desk."

At the same time, its status is so lofty that the people attracted by its power and authority can easily develop what the late Jack Bell called "red carpet virus" in his 1960 book on the presidency, "The Splendid Misery."

"This is the miasma that attacks men when they work close to the sources of great power, move in exciting circles and become celebrities accustomed to all of the extra-fare attentions that are paid to the great," wrote Bell, longtime chief political correspondent of The Associated Press.

Bell was explaining the downfall of the first White House chief of staff, Sherman Adams.

He quit after disclosure that he had accepted gifts, including a \$700 vicuna coat, from a Boston industrialist seeking favorable treatment from the government.

Three decades later, Bell's words still seem appropriate in considering the case of John H. Sununu, who has clearly gotten to like the world of private jets and government limousines, regardless of whether they are the only available means of travel.

Besides the temptations of the "red carpet virus," life in the White House often seems to create an exaggerated sense of self-importance. That helps to explain why so many chiefs of staff have gotten into trouble for essentially the same reason: abuse of power.

Indeed, of the 13 people who have held the job since 1953, Sununu is the fifth to get himself into hot water of one sort or another. Most, like the abrasive and combative Bush aide, had laid the basis for trouble by their previous actions.

Four chiefs of staff — Adams, H.R. Haldeman, Donald T. Regan and Sununu — had sufficiently antagonized other officials through their imperious ways that they had a

shortage of supporters when they got into trouble.

The fifth, Hamilton Jordan, produced a similar reaction by insulting some of his party's principal figures and behaving in a way that many thought unsuitable for a senior White House aide before taking on the job.

The result was that each was ripe for a fall when he misstepped in ways ranging from the seemingly trivial — Sununu's use of a

shortage of supporters when they got into trouble.

The fifth, Hamilton Jordan, produced a similar reaction by insulting some of his party's principal figures and behaving in a way that many thought unsuitable for a senior White House aide before taking on the job.

The result was that each was ripe for a fall when he misstepped in ways ranging from the seemingly trivial — Sununu's use of a

military plane to visit his dentist and a limousine to attend a stamp auction — to the criminal — Haldeman's misdeeds in seeking to cover up the Watergate scandal.

Adams, like Sununu a former New Hampshire governor, used a rigid manner and a streak of Yankee morality in dispensing patronage and handling other domestic business for Eisenhower.

It undercut his position when he engaged

in the kind of behavior he had always decried.

Haldeman, who ruled Richard M. Nixon's White House with an iron hand, was one of several of that ill-fated president's men who came to grief in the unsuccessful effort to contain the scandal stemming from a bungled effort to bug the Democratic National Committee offices.

Both Adams and Haldeman operated primarily behind the scenes. So did Jordan, though his embarrassments, such as a much-publicized spitting incident in a Washington bar, often occurred in public.

Indeed, some of the most effective chiefs of staff rarely performed in public, such as Dick Cheney in the Ford administration and James A. Baker III in Ronald Reagan's first term. In recent years, however, chiefs of staff have become increasingly public figures.

Regan, the most politically inept chief of staff of recent times, was also the most aggressive in thrusting himself into the forefront.

He was forced out after he mishandled the most difficult moment of his troubled two-year tenure, the 1986 Iran-contra affair.

Sununu has been both a principal public spokesman for President Bush and his chief behind-the-scenes domestic and political operative.

Like Regan, who antagonized many prominent Republican lawmakers before he entered the White House, Sununu has tangled with virtually every top Republican inside and outside the administration.

That's why his troubles have attracted so little public support from fellow Republicans and why, even inside the White House, it's hard to count many people likely to urge Bush to keep him.

His job seems safe for now. But the history of troubled aides is that a way is usually found for them to move on, even if an immediate controversy doesn't sink them.

So it would surprise few people in this town if on a quiet Friday in August, Bush decides that Sununu could serve him better in his re-election campaign or elsewhere.

### Governor asks for report on police radio improvements

**POCATELLO** — Gov. Cecil Andrus says he has asked his law enforcement director for a report on any improvements needed in the state police radio network.

If improvements are necessary, the governor told the Idaho Peace Officers Association in Pocatello Tuesday, he will support them.

Idaho State Police Cpl. Steve Hobbs of Declo was shot by an assailant on Interstate 84 southeast of Burley. ISP officers have said radio communication between the site of the shooting, a remote valley just north of the Utah-Idaho border, and the regional dispatcher in Twin Falls is often impossible.

"I'm happy to be able to tell you today that following a week of uncertainty and the first of a series of operations, Cpl. Hobbs is healing," the governor said.

Andrus said a nerve has been grafted into his right arm, although it will be a year or so before it will be known whether Hobbs will regain the use of it.

A Wisconsin man has been charged in the shooting.

Andrus said he has asked Richard Cade, director of the Department of Law Enforcement, to send him a status report.

### Authorities searching for boy who escaped from area motel

**TWIN FALLS** — Authorities were looking for a 16-year-old boy Thursday night who escaped from the local motel that houses the county's juvenile offenders.

The Twin Falls boy was wearing an orange jail jumpsuit when he scampered out side door that guards thought was locked at 10:50 p.m. Wednesday, Twin Falls County Sheriff Jim Munn said.

Although Munn described the youngster as "pretty street-wise," probation officials said his criminal record consists mainly of petty crimes.

"He's probably not much of a threat as far as hurting someone," Doug Rublaint, the county's senior juvenile probation officer said.

The county began keeping juveniles who are sentenced to detention or arrested and waiting court hearings at the Econo Lodge, 320 Main Ave. S., shortly after the area's only juvenile detention center closed August 31.

### Mink farm case will be 1st to allow cameras in courtroom

**BOISE** — A case involving a Heyburn mink farm will be the subject of a historical court proceeding here Friday.

For the first time ever, cameras will be allowed into the courtroom during a Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals hearing.

The session before the three-judge panel is scheduled for the Federal Bankruptcy Court at 9 a.m.

On the docket are arguments by attorneys representing Myrtle Mink Farm of Heyburn, which is appealing a decision by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to impose penalties on the company for failing to complete forms verifying that employees were not unauthorized aliens.

Two other Idaho cases are scheduled for hearings.

Under federal judicial procedure, cameras are generally not permitted in courtrooms when court is in session.

## Ex-CSI rodeo member files complaint with state

**TWIN FALLS** — A former member of the College of Southern Idaho rodeo team has filed a sexual discrimination claim against the school with the Idaho Human Rights Commission.

Lorraine Johnston claims CSI Rodeo Director Shawn Davis assigned her to wash the athletic supporters of male rodeo members as a rodeo-club assignment.

Johnston, who will enroll in Boise State University in the fall, also alleges that the college has denied that Davis discriminated against women and by doing so, condoned his actions.

She filed a grievance with the school in January and said Thursday that CSI officials have done little about it since.

President Gerald Meyerhoeffer declined comment on the human rights claim, but said the college has 30 days to respond and will do so.

"We're making some changes related to that," Meyerhoeffer said, but he refused to elaborate. "We're attempting to do this right, and we always have as far as that goes."

Davis could not be reached for comment. He previously denied ever assigning Johnston to wash the athletic supporters, although he said he was present when a team member made the assignment.

He also has said the assignment was not unusual and was not intended to demean Johnston.

Johnston said she quit the team last spring after receiving pressure from other team members and when her grievance with the college did not resolve the alleged problems.

Before filing the grievance, Johnston said she had been a starter on the three-member CSI women's rodeo team, but was taken off the squad even though she had an Inter-mountain District ranking in two events.

Davis has previously said that selecting team members is a subjective decision and that his record of 13 regional men's championships demonstrates he knows how to pick the people. He said Johnston's replacement did well, proving him right.

Idaho Human Rights Commission Director Marilyn Schuler said she could not comment on any case the panel is handling, not even to confirm or deny that a complaint had been filed.

Typically the commission seeks to resolve claims without assigning blame within three months after a claim is made, Schuler said. About 40 percent of the cases are handled by that time, she said.

After that, the commission will investigate the claim and write a report, Schuler said. A nine-member board of commissioners determines if a law has been broken, she said.

If not, the commission will end its involvement, Schuler said. The complainant could pursue the case in court, although few have, she said.

If the commission finds merit in the claim, it would become the complainant's advocate and seek to redress the problem, Schuler said. Failing that, the panel — which has no power to enforce its own decisions — could take the case to court, she said.

## County almost ready to move juvenile detainees into fairgrounds building

**FILER** — It ain't pretty, but Twin Falls County officials say the temporary home they have created for problem juveniles will be effective.

Sheriff Jim Munn said he hopes to move the juvenile detainees currently being held in local motel rooms to the remodeled Flowers and Produce Building at the Twin Falls County Fairgrounds by Tuesday.

"Compared to the motel, security at this facility will be much easier," Munn said.

That will be a relief for detention guards, who have experienced two escapes and two more near-escapes since the county

began holding juveniles in motel rooms in September. The Magic Valley was left without a juvenile detention facility when the Southern Idaho Youth Center closed Aug. 31.

An extensive remodeling project has turned one quarter of the cinder-block display building at the fairgrounds into a seven-bed detention center that the county will use until a permanent center is built.

"We're really quite proud of what we've put together out here," County Commissioner Norma Blass said. Fair officials, state and local fire officials and Department of Health and Welfare experts were all consulted to ensure the project will meet all regulations, she said.

The building is far too big for the county's use, so a collapsible fire wall had to be installed, reducing the actual living space. Please see MOVE/B2

## Governments combine to help Trans IV in Mini-Cassia

**RUPERT** — For those in the Mini-Cassia area who depend on the Trans IV bus service for their mobility and independence, there is good news — the buses will run another year.

County commissioners and city councils in Minidoka County have opted to fund, on a one-time basis only, a share of the \$11,000 funding deficit Trans IV faces for the coming fiscal year.

The Rupert, Paul, and Heyburn city councils and the Minidoka County commissioners have passed resolutions to fund Trans IV.

The city of Paul and the county, however, stipulated that their resolutions are valid only if all other local government entities fund Trans IV.

"They (members of an advisory board) thought we should fund them for this year, and one year only, because it is at the 11th hour," Minidoka County Commissioner Lyle Barton said at a special commissioners meeting this week.

Burley's City Council will discuss the Trans IV item at its meeting on Monday. The Cassia County commissioner's July 8 agenda will include Trans IV.

Trans IV officials originally set July 1 as the deadline for getting financing to continue service in the Mini-Cassia area.

"I'm willing to wait," said Trans IV director James D. Vining.

The advisory board, made up of representatives from the various local government entities, agreed to recommend funding to their individual government groups, Vining said.

The advisory board will continue to be part of the Trans IV program in the area.

"It will primarily decide what kind of service, how much, and whether they want to continue and how to support it," Vining said of the board. "We have a year to come up with something."

"We are very willing to accept the advice of the board," Vining added.

"I'm very pleased with the Rupert, Hey-

burn, Paul and Minidoka County decisions. I think that is a big step," Vining said.

Vining plans on a separate board being formed on the other end of the Magic Valley where Trans IV provides service.

The Mini-Cassia area board will choose two representatives to sit on a general board that will have equal representation from the entire service area.

"This is how I see it," Vining said. "We are still in the self-contained classrooms with all the evenings for adult interactive education ranging from Idaho State classes to one-on-one business counseling tailored to individual needs of rural residents."

Lynn Candick, US West director of internal affairs, presented the check to Barton, County Commissioner Caroline Melroe.

The first seven schools to get the classrooms will be Idaho Falls, Soda Springs, Malad, Fort Hall, Rockland, Twin Falls and Hazelton. ISU will be the hub where all classes will originate. By the end of the four-year, \$2.2 million project, it is anticipated that Ketchum, Burley, Arco, Preston, Montpelier and Rexburg also will be linked.

will get a percentage of pay-per-view television revenues.

Mills Lane, a Nevada, District Court judge from Reno, will be the referee this time. Lane officiated Tyson's championship victories over Trevor Berbick, James "Bonecrusher" Smith and Tony Tucker.

The first fight might have ended in controversy, but while it was in progress Tyson was dominant. He led by six points after six rounds on the cards of all three judges.

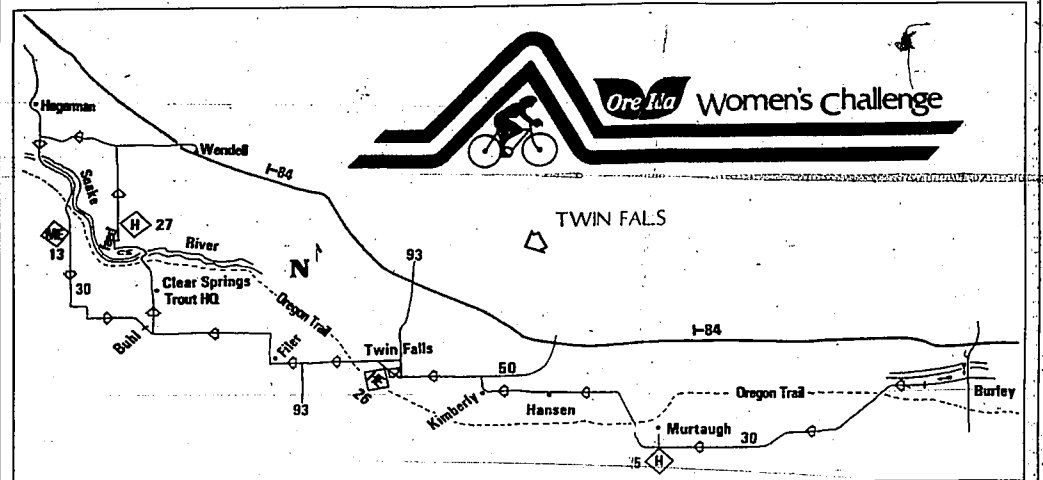

# Counties to start verifying street guides for enhanced 911 system

**TWIN FALLS** — Lincoln, Gooding, Jerome and Twin Falls counties will soon start verifying street address guides for an enhanced 911 emergency communications system.

Workers from U S West Communications compiled the guides, which list streets and addresses in each county. The counties must make sure the lists are correct.

After the counties verify the accuracy of the street guides, they must assign streets to emergency service zones. These zones will include streets and addresses served by the same law enforcement, fire and ambulance agencies.

"This is the most time-consuming job," West projects manager Sandra Rivers told county officials Thursday.

It's also a job that never ends, she said. The counties will update the street guides as communities grow, adding more houses and roads.

Rivers laid out a schedule for the counties to verify the street address guides and assign emergency service zones to them by Sept. 12. The street guides and emergency service zones will then be returned to U S West.

When the company gets the verified street address guides and emergency service zones back, it will compare its list of customer telephone numbers with the street addresses. Numbers and addresses that do not match will be corrected, Rivers said.

Making sure streets, addresses and telephone numbers match is an important step in setting up an E911 system.

dress of the caller and show which law enforcement, fire or ambulance department should be contacted. To do this, streets, addresses, telephone numbers and emergency service zones must be listed correctly.

The schedule Rivers laid out shows the E911 system could be working a year from now.

But Twin Falls County Commissioner Jim Hempleman said that date is questionable. The counties still need to decide where the system dispatch center will be placed.

But the counties probably will meet their goal of having the system within two months of when voters approved a \$1-a-month charge to fund it last November, Hempleman said.

**STANLEY (AP)** — The deputy director of the Bonneville Power Administration came to central Idaho to look at his agency's program to clean up upstream problems threatening the future of Pacific Northwest salmon.

Robertson said the problem with sockeye salmon is only in the Snake River system. "There's a general impression that the last two sockeyes are 'struggling up the Salmon River, but the salmon fisheries have actually increased," he said.

Representatives from Idaho Fish and Game, U.S. Forest Service and the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes led Robertson on a tour of habitat problems and how Fish and Game is dealing with them. Some of the projects, including a hatchery, are funded by BPA.

# Inspectors don't expect further INEL shutdowns

**IDAHO FALLS (AP)** — The leader of the Tiger Team inspecting the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory for health, safety and environmental compliance doesn't expect further work stoppages resulting from the probe.

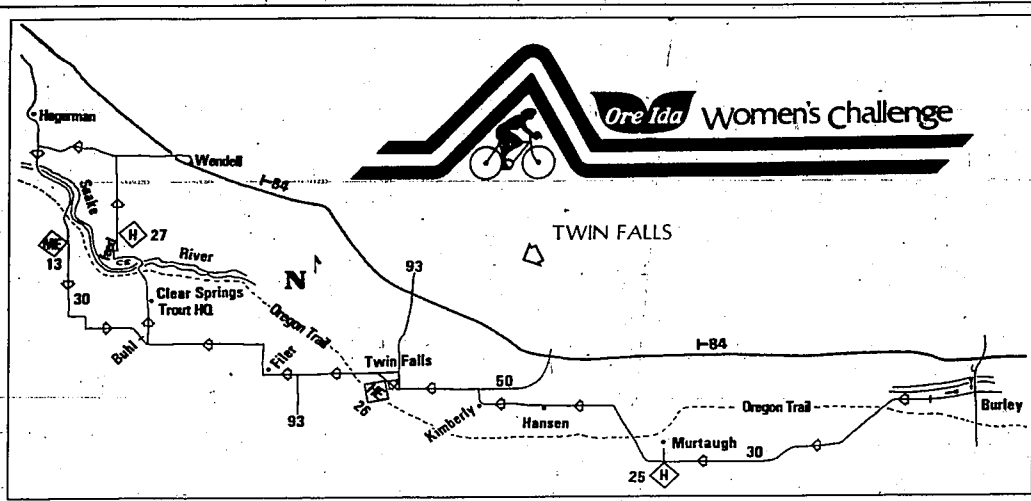

"I'd say there were 80 potential draft choices, and 54 got drafted," supercut Marty Blake said. "It's just who you like. You might be better off not being drafted. That way you can pick and choose."

Wednesday night, 54 players were taken in the two rounds of the NBA draft. That left a lot of players looking for teams on Thursday, including the likes of Anderson Hunt of UNLV, Melvin Cheatum of Alabama, Tony Farmer of Nebraska and Roy Fisher of California.

"Most of these kids will get invited to camp," New York Knicks scout Dick McGuire said. "That's what we're trying to do right now. We're trying to like Fisher."

Some of the undrafted were surprised, some weren't, and many of them were naturally disappointed.

"By all rights," said Farmer, the 6-foot-9, 225-pounder from Nebraska who declared for the draft in May after being declared ineligible because of an NCAA violation.

"My agent was stunned. As late as this afternoon, he still had people telling him I could go in the first round," Farmer said. "I'm disappointed I didn't get drafted, but I've talked

to a guy from the Chicago Bulls already, and my agent will make calls, so I'll get a chance."

Also undrafted were top 50 prospects Greg Lee of Ohio State, Reggie Hanson of Kentucky, Derrin Chalmers of Southern Miss and Jean Derouillere of Kansas State.

"Anderson Hunt is very tiny. That's the biggest knock against him," McGuire said. "I was surprised Cheatum wasn't drafted, very surprised that Fisher wasn't, and surprised that Greg Lee and Chancellor weren't drafted."

Brian Shorter of Pitt might have been the best of all of them, and he wasn't drafted, either.

"What it comes down to is, all these kids need one guy in any organization to like him, and he'll get invited to camp," McGuire said. "For some reason, you like this guy, he likes that guy. That's what it comes down to now."

Hunt, 6-2 and 175 pounds, came out after his junior season. He averaged 17.2 points and had 95 assists for the national champion Runnin' Rebels last year. Three of its teammates, Larry Johnson, Stacey Augmon and Greg Anthony, were drafted in the first round.

# Nuggets' pick wants to work on offense

DENVER (AP) — Dikembe Mutombo, 7-foot-2 Georgetown center and top draft choice of the Denver Nuggets, has a lofty goal for himself — being rookie of the year — and maybe improving his offensive skills, he said at his first news conference on Thursday.

But not on his list of goals is improving his relationship with the press.

"I don't like the media — they don't like me," he said, without a trace of a smile.

Mutombo denied his position is influenced by Georgetown coach John Thompson, who he respects and loves and refers to as "my dad."

But it possibly stems in part from sports columnists' criticism of his lack of scoring punch.

"Never mind," he told reporters. NBA great Bill Russell had "11 championship rings for his ten fingers," and never averaged 20 points a game in his entire professional career.

Russell has been working with him in the gymnasium, Mutombo said. And so has former Georgetown great Patrick Ewing, another man he admires.

Mutombo, Big East defensive player of the year as a senior, ranked fourth in the nation in blocked shots with 151 and sixth in rebounding with 12.2 per game. He conceded his initial year in the league must be a process by hard work and "concentration on everything."

"I'll work on my offense," he said. "You guys have been criticizing my offense," he reminded reporters.

Mutombo sat out his freshman year while continuing to learn English, but as a sophomore he led the team in field goal percentage with .707.

Not bad for a guy who hated basketball as a kid and was forced into the game by his father and brother. "It was a bad experience. I was soft. Everybody was beating on me."

In spite of that he became comfortable with the game and believes he can work under the pressure that is a part of NBA play.

"I played even when I couldn't hear because a crowd of 65,000 in New Orleans," he pointed out.

# Indians trade Candiotti in 6-player deal

CLEVELAND (AP) — The Cleveland Indians, convinced they could no longer afford Tom Candiotti, traded the knuckleballer to the Toronto Blue Jays on Thursday as part of a six-player deal.

The 33-year-old Candiotti can become a free agent after the season, but he is seeking a four-year contract. The Indians were unwilling to offer more than three years. His salary this season is \$2.5 million.

Cleveland sent Candiotti and minor-league outfielder Turner Ward to Toronto for outfielders Mark Whiten and Glennan Hill, left-handed pitcher Denis Boucher and a player to be named later. The teams had been discussing a trade since spring training.

Candiotti (7-6) was leading the Indians in wins, and his 2.24 ERA ranked third in the American League. He had double figures in wins in four of his five full seasons in Cleveland.

"I think it's a good deal for both teams," said Toronto manager Cito Gaston, who said Candiotti will start Friday night against Seattle. "I know they got some good players and we got a quality pitcher. If he pitches for us the way he pitched against us, this will really help our staff."

Before the season began, Candiotti said he wanted a four-year contract worth more than \$10 million, similar to the deal former teammate Bud Black got as a free-agent acquisition in San Francisco this season. The Indians, however, would not budge from their three-year offer.

"A counter-offer was made by Candiotti's agent that was too good for the club to consider, and negotiations then ceased," Indians president Colleen Walker, Deb Richard and Barb Mucha had 67a. Pat Bradley, Meg-Mallon and Nina-Foust were two shots back, while Amy Alcott and Judy Dickson were in a group of 11 at 69.

Ayako Okamoto was among eight golfers at 70, and defending champion Beth Daniel shot a 71.

Given the fact that McHaffie had missed the cut in five of her last six tournaments and was ranked No. 107 on the money list, there was little reason to believe she would play so well on Thursday. But McHaffie figured it was just a matter of time before the ball started rolling her way.

"I don't feel that surprised," she said. "I've been hitting well and putting great, but it just has not gone for me—I haven't had my really bad rounds in the last couple of months. ... It's just that the puts I made for birdies today, I haven't been making."

Despite six of those puts found the hole, the 33-year-old former school teacher is in the unique position atop the leaderboard.

# Alzado says steroids part of his game

NEW YORK (AP) — Lyle Alzado, the former All-Pro defensive end, says his prospering shooting career was caused by steroids he took while trying to make a comeback in the NFL last year.

"I'm half the man I was, and not everything works," Alzado said in an interview on NBC's "Football" with Maria Shriver, which will air Saturday.

In the interview, he said that when he was playing, 75 percent of the players in the league took steroids or some form of performance enhancer. He also told Shriver that he took steroids almost all of his 14 years in the league with the Denver Broncos, Cleveland Browns and Los Angeles Raiders.

"And I got me where I wanted, but it also got me very sick," the 42-year-old Alzado said. He said that in an effort to try to make the Raiders team last year, "I used a certain steroid that caused me to ruin my immune system."

Alzado was diagnosed with a rare form of brain lymphoma last April. His treatment includes radiation, oral cortisone and chemotherapy.

"My dreams are different now that they once were," Alzado said. "You know, before I wanted to go to the Super Bowl. ... It's not those things anymore. It's different. It's just a workman's dream. To work, to have a nice car, a nice house. You know, to live decently. To treat people decently."

"To live," Shriver said. "Yeah. To live is more important than anything," he said.

Alzado retired from football in 1985, one of the most feared and fearsome figures on the field.

# Algerian wins 1,500 meters at World Games track meet

HELSINKI, Finland (AP) — Noureddine Morceli of Algeria, helped by excellent pacemaking from American Ray Brown, clocked the fastest time of the year in 1,500 meters at the World Games Grand Prix track and field meet Thursday.

Morceli, starting his kick on the backstretch, won the race in 3 minutes, 21.00 seconds for a new national record. It was just one and a half second off the world record of 3:29.46 set by Said Aouita of Morocco six years ago.

But Morceli, who spent three months training in California for the outdoor season, did break Aouita's meet record of 3:31.80, set at Olympic Stadium in 1987. "I'm very satisfied with my time," said Morceli, who was ranked No. 1 in the world at 1,500 meters last year.

"But I could have run even faster if I had been pushed by another runner toward the end. And it was very windy out there."

Morceli, who had only run once outdoors in the 800 meters before this meet, posted the 14th fastest time in track's blue-ribbon event.

Simon Doyle of Australia was second in 3:32.79 with 1987 world champion Abdi Bile of Somalia third in 3:34.72. Steve Scott, the United States' top miler in the last decade, was only 12th in 3:40.49 in a field of 14 runners.

Khalid Skah of Morocco also produced an outstanding result to win the 5,000 meters in 13:17.72 for another 1991 world best.

Fita Biyissa was runnerup in 13:18.28 followed by fellow Ethiopian Adhis Abete in 13:27.27. Arturo Barras of Mexico, the world 10,000-meter record holder, took fourth in 13:26.56.

It was a big disappointment for Barras, who received the Panvo Nations trophy as the world's best long-distance runner in 1990 during a ceremony before the meet.

Steve Plascencia was the top U.S. finisher, placing seventh in 13:29.87. Pattisue Plumer took the lead at the last lap, and was edged by fellow American Shelly Steely to win the women's 3,000 meters in 8:51.10.

Plumer, making her European season debut after winning the 3,000 meters record in the 1987 U.S. Championships, was almost 17 seconds off the Olympic Stadium record, set by Mary Slaney in the 1983 World Championships.

# Roberts, Scott give life to 'Dying Young'

**HOLLYWOOD** - If it does nothing else (and nothing else is pretty much what it does), "Dying Young" makes clear to any peevish doubters why Julia Roberts gets the big bucks. The storyline for this "Love Story" knock-off may be as insubstantial as, well, "Love Story," but Roberts (with considerable help from co-star Campbell Scott) has the unstoppable watchability to involve us in it not only against our will but often against our better judgment as well.

## Review

Though Roberts may stretch her limbs as her career progresses, at present, very much like Clint Eastwood in his prime, her range is not the broadest but she is peerless within it. Also like Eastwood, she tends to star in genre pictures, updated not-for-women-only "fairytale" tales that trade heavily on the fact that audiences will invariably be pulling for her like nobody's business.

In this case, like the earlier "Pretty Woman," the fairy tale model is Cinderella. Hilary O'Neil may not be scrubbing kitchen floors when we meet her, but her prospects are as bleak as any scullery maid's.

Surprising her beau in bed with another woman (the foot), she storms out of their South San Francisco apartment and moves back to nearby Oakland with her nagging, Shopping Network-addicted mother (a brief appearance by Ellen Burstyn) who challenges her to "make something happen for once in your life."

Dutifully scanning the classifieds, Hilary spies an ad calling for "a young attractive female with some nursing skills."

Putting on her highest heels and shortened red miniskirt (hey, this is Hollywood), she totters to the top of tony Nob Hill only to be told by a father of biblical sternness that, thank you very much, what his son needs is professional care of the highest caliber.

Fortunately for the plot, however, Dad has to jet off right that second on a high-level trip to Japan, and the son, having gotten a glimpse of those famous legs, decides he knows what's best for himself after all and hires Hilary for the job. As the name is Victor Geddes, he is about to begin a wrenching series of chemotherapy treatments for the leukemia that has been crippling him for the last 10 years.

Her job is to be a combination nurse-cook-companion. Romance, they both soberly assure each other, is nowhere in the equation.

We in the audience, of course, know better, not only because the ads

have trumpeted it, but because these two are so magnificently unsuited to each other.

He is working toward a Ph.D. in art, she has barely heard of Van Gogh. His mother knew pianist Artur Schnabel, hers collects tacky toy dolls.

He is a devotee of nouvelle cuisine, she puts mayonnaise in her hair. How could they help but fall in love?

The producers have been extraordinarily fortunate in casting Scott as young Mr. Geddes, the prince in the castle on the hill.

Having attracted notice with small parts in "Longtime Companion" and "The Sheltering Sky," Scott (whose mother, Colleen Dewhurst, has a supporting role) here manages a leading role with total aplomb.

A more cerebral actor than Roberts, he takes a very effective low-key approach to Victor, managing to play both the weakness of disease and the awkwardness of a sheltered life while still maintaining enough virility to be a more than credible romantic lead.

As for Roberts, it is not so much her cascading hair or even her take-no-prisoners smile that makes her such a potent cinematic force.

Rather, in the tradition of screen idols since the dawn of time, she manages to seem more alive than life itself on the screen, alternately projecting resilience and vulnerability as conflicting emotions play across her face like light on water.

# Fires are more grabbing than story in 'Backdraft'

**BACKDRAFT** (R). If fires had press agents, the spectacular blazes which energize this film would have their names up in lights and the flesh and blood stars would end up in small print. **CITY SLICKERS** (PG-13). The old gambit of setting a bunch of clified nincompoops loose in the wide open spaces is not a fresh one, but it's still funny. There are enough laughs in "City Slickers" to get you through the wispy-washing mud-bonding stuff. Billy Crystal, Bruno Kirby and Daniel Stern are the three buddies who take a two-week vacation as cattle herders. As the leadery trail guide, Jack Palance steals the movie.

**DON'T TELL MOM THE BABYSITTER'S DEAD** (PG-13). Is that a catchy title? Is this a dopey movie? Many high-concept-driven pseudo-black comedy wish fulfillment saga about five kids whose mother and baby sitter conveniently vanish, leaving them stuck in the teen-film clichés. As directed by Stephen Herek, with Christina Applegate as the teen Melanie Griffith, this is a movie whose morality is as banal as its humor ... and that's saying something.

**DROP DEAD FRED** (PG-13). In this fantasy comedy — about a distraught young woman besieged by her imaginary childhood friend, carrot-headed British punk D.D. Fred — Dutch director Ate De Jong and the writers try to capture some of the verve and spirit of "Beetlejuice." Welcome to the world of casting, arguably the most important and undervalued of the film art forms.

Direction gives a movie or television show its aim, power and subtlety. Producing takes care of the budget; production design takes care of the look. And then there's casting, a marriage of chemistry and neuroscience and, in the right hands, a testimony to clout.

Casting can virtually CREATE a motion picture, as it did in "Robin Hood," or make a star from scratch, as it did for Julia Roberts, an unknown who caught the eye of the casting director of a little film called "Mystic Pizza" — and then someone else's eye in what was supposed to be a Richard Gere comeback film, "Pretty Woman."

Casting — or not being cast or failing to recognize the Big Role — also has the power to derail a promising career. Peter Boyle was offered the role of Popeye Doyle in "The French Connection" but turned

it down. Enter second choice Gene Hackman, who went onto win a "Best Actor" Academy Award and superstar status.

For all their power and muscle, casting directors are an enigmatic lot.

While moviegoers may be somewhat familiar with the names of A-list casting directors like Juliet Taylor (who casts Woody Allen's pictures), Ellen Chenoweth (Barry

Levinson's), Mike Fenton (Steven Spielberg's) and Billy Hopkins and Risa Brunon (Oliver Stone's), most are probably unaware of how these folks ultimately shape the product they just plunked down \$6 to see.

"I am pained that casting is such an integral part of the artistic process, and yet we are barely appreciated or understood," says Fenton, who has cast over 250 films.

Meanwhile, Stevenson's replacement on "M.A.S.H.," Harry Morgan, had a long and prosperous run in the role of Col. Sherman Potter. McLean who?

• When Valerie Harper bitterly walked away from her NBC sitcom, "Valerie," in a 1987 dispute with the producers, a quickie name change was in order. First, it was switched to "Valerie's Family," though Valerie was nowhere to be seen. Finally, with Sandy Duncan ensconced in the show's primary adult role, the name was changed again to "The Hogan Family." And Valerie? She was more fun as Rhonda, anyway.

• When it came to changing husbands on "Bewitched," they merely switched Dicks. Dick York played Darrin Stephens to Elizabeth Montgomery's Samantha on the highly rated ABC sitcom from 1964 to 1969. 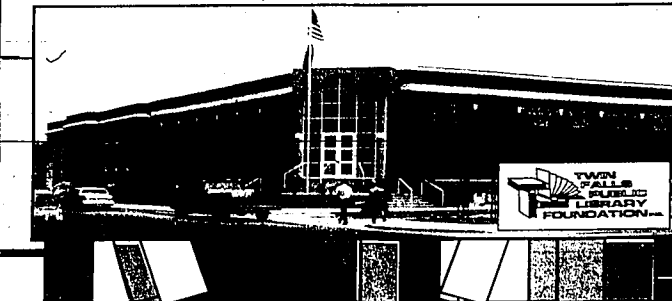

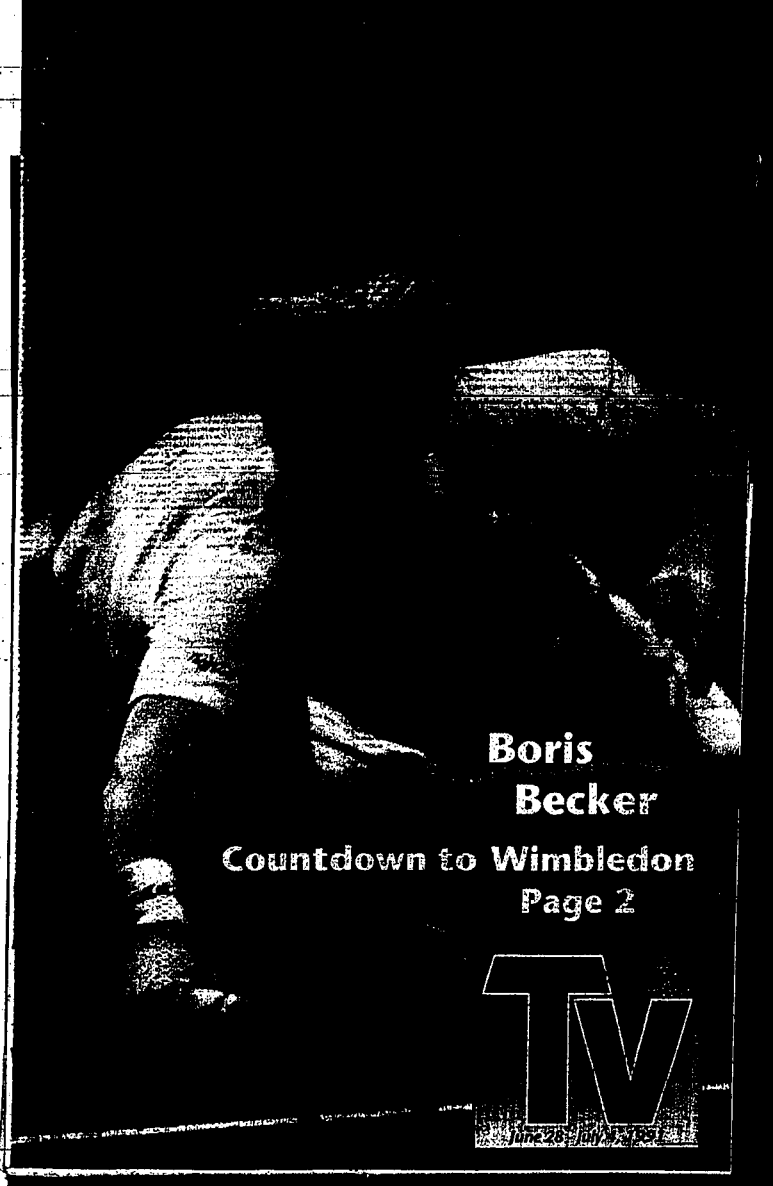

# Wimbledon tennis tournament games slam onto television screens this week

Nineteen years ago, a brash young American stepped onto the hallowed turf at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club and offended just about every stuffy British tennis fan in the land with his abhorrent behavior.

But there is no doubt that they were also impressed by his gutsy play. Today, at 38, Jimmy Connors may have lost a step, but he hasn't lost his fire and passion for tennis.

This year, Connors is returning to Wimbledon — site of the "114th All England Tennis Championships" — as an announcer for NBC. And he plans to be playing on the very courts where he won in 1974 and again in 1982. NBC continues its coverage of the early rounds this week, with evening updates and live coverage of the women's semifinals on Thursday, July 4, the men's semifinals on Friday, July 5, the women's finals on Saturday, July 6, culminating with the men's finals on Sunday, July 7.

Connors, who was ranked the No. 1 player in the world for more consecutive weeks than any other player in history (159 — July 29, 1974, to Aug. 16, 1977), says he was surprised he did as well as he did at his first Wimbledon. (He lost to another bad boy, Ilie Nastase, in the quarterfinals.) "It was my attitude vs. their tradition," he says. "But it didn't really detract from my play."

At 38, Connors still plays like a man possessed. At the recent French Open, he staged a brilliant come-

back in the third round against Michael Chang, only to retire in the fifth set because of back problems. Connors, incidentally, won his first pro title a week before Chang was born.

We diplomatically asked Connors about whom he might pick to win Wimbledon this year, and he was the same old Jimbo, replying, "I think I should do pretty well. I'm up about the game, and I'm hungry ... and that's when I play my best tennis."

But you can count on usual big hitters. Boris Becker is playing really well right now, and Stefan Edberg (last year's champion) is too. Anybody with a power game can come through at Wimbledon. (Wimbledon is played on grass courts, the fastest surface and a benefit for hard hitters.)

"But I don't know about this sheer power game," Connors con-

tinues.

"I don't know if they even use their heads. Players used to be more like artists, like Nastase ... and McEnroe."

Connors' fondest memory of Wimbledon was the final against John McEnroe in 1982. It was also one of the best matches in Wimbledon's history. "Mac was at the top of his game, and I was glad just to be in the final at that point," Connors says. "In typical Connors style, he fought and scratched for every point, and at the end of the battle he won in five grueling sets, 3-6, 6-3, 6-7, 7-6, 6-4."

Nevertheless, Warner is fairly level-headed. He hated a job he once had — bagging groceries. He prefers to stay home and cook Cajun dishes for "someone special." People who knew him in high school, he tells me, thought he "had it all together. And I didn't."

**Q: Whatever became of Evelyn Keyes, the fine Hollywood actress who was a real leading lady in a lot of '40s flicks? Is she still alive? — Y.L.**

**A: Keyes, 72, was born in Texas, and began her career as a dancer. She starred in quite a few mostly forgettable '40s movies. I run across Keyes occasionally, and she never fails to brief me on the latest in her new career as an author. **Q: Apart from "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves," was Errol Flynn's earlier version the only time this character has been brought to the screen? — R.L.**

**A: Robin Hood has been a movie staple ever since the silent era, with Douglas Fairbanks as Robin Hood. All in all, Robin Hood has righted wrongs in no less than 15 films. These include such offbeat casting as Sean Connery and George Segal; Frank Sinatra in a gangland update ("Robin and the Seven Hoods"); a Disney cartoon; and a few "Sons of" excursions.**

**Q: Why in the world is a great artist like Woody Allen going to push spaghetti sauce on Italian TV? This must be some wild rumor. — G.W.**

**A: Any number of top stars have trumped off to foreign lands to be in commercials because the money is incredibly good. # 'World' star's on the big screen too

John Aprea, who has been playing Lucas for almost two years on "Another World," can also be seen on the nation's movie screens as a Mafia Don in "New Jack City" and he appeared in his recurring role as John Stamos' father in "Full House" in the wedding episode.

John is almost always approached by people who think they know him and it's because they have seen him in one of his movies or TV appearances. 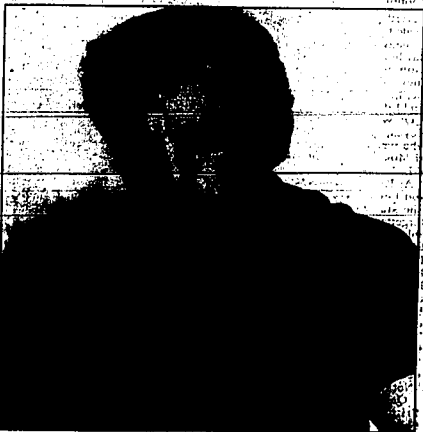

TV in the original "Untouchables" series, is seriously ill and confined to a wheelchair. Is that so? — LP.

A: Bob Stack is the most terrific looking 72-year-old I've ever encountered. He and his wife, Rosemary, still set a high standard as a couple for classy-looking Hollywoodians. They always look great. One scandal sheet had it that Stack is wheelchair-bound until he steps in front of the cameras. That's nonsense, and Bob Stack is steaming. "I'm an athlete," he snaps. "That story had my wife in tears." The scandal sheet printed a retraction!

Q: We really like Jeanne Cooper, the veteran actress on "The Young and the Restless." What's this about her leaving the show? — J.D.

A: What rubbish. Jeanne Cooper has been playing the role of Katherine Chancellor Sterling on the daytime soap for the last 18 years. She's wedded to the part, she tells me. She also says the show's writers might figure out a way that Ms. Chancellor Sterling will run for high public office — perhaps governor — next season. In private, Cooper's a human-rights and animal-rights activist, so she figures she's qualified to empathize with all species, even politicians.

Q: What's this about Dennis Hopper becoming a conservative Republican? How can such a transformation occur to Hollywood's

age-old symbol of sex, drugs and rock 'n' roll? — J.B.

A: All I can tell you is that I witnessed during the recent Cannes Film Festival. At a beach-front pavilion operated by a number of Americans, Hopper was called upon to say a few words at the opening ceremony. Hopper turned up in a crew cut. He reminded his audience — in loud tones — that he's proud to be an American. And he expressed support for President Bush's handling of the Gulf War. The Cannes audience was astounded, and even booed the actor. Hopper is now 55, and has apparently left behind the anarchistic tendencies of his youth.

Q: Did veteran actor Glenn Ford refuse to play a role in a new movie about John Kennedy's assassination? What exactly was the problem? — H.J.

A: Glenn Ford, 75, made his Hollywood movie debut more than a half century ago. Since then, he's carved out a distinguished career, often playing intense characters pursuing righteous causes. Fittingly enough, Ford was cast in director Oliver Stone's new flick, "JFK," about the Kennedy assassination. The veteran actor was forced to withdraw not because of any principle, perceived or real. He had to go into the hospital for what he told me was "minor surgery." He emerged in good shape and moved on to another project — a TV movie about ani-

mals and ecology.

Q: Is TV star Jill St. John really writing a sexy novel based on her marriage to Robert Wagner? What spicy things will she tell us? — Y.V.

A: Sorry to disillusion you. But Jill has no plan to write about — or even discuss for print — the intimacies of her Wagner union. Rumors may have started when someone suggested the couple's romantic story be turned into a segment on "Amazing Love Stories," featuring dramatic recreations on TV of celebrity romances. St. John serves as the show's hostess. When asked if her own marriage qualified for the show, Jill said: "I doubt if it could be that interesting." Wonder what Wagner thinks of that remark!

Q: What's become of Jack Klugman, the fine actor who was so good in "The Odd Couple" series on TV? Why don't we see more of him? — M.R.

A: In the late 1980s, Jack lost part of his vocal cords during throat-cancer surgery. The implications for the engagingly gravely voiced actor were obvious.

He couldn't work until he regained what remained of his voice. I spotted him in a swanky Hollywood hotel not long ago, looking great. He sounded stronger than I recall hearing him in years. He called his recovery "a miracle." Now Jack, who's 69, plans to return to live stage work, which he can now handle with the aid of a microphone.

# CBS wins latest television ratings war with comedies, made-for-TV movies

LOS ANGELES (AP) — CBS won the latest ratings battle with a boost from its Monday night comedy lineup and a rerun of a made-for-television movie about the real-life Aloha Airlines disaster.

CBS earned a 9.5 average rating for last week, followed by ABC's 9.2 and NBC's 8.4, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

CBS' "Evening Shade," a home-spun comedy series about small-town life, was the No. 2 show. The network's smart-talking TV journalists of "Murphy Brown" placed third.

"Miracle Landing," a CBS docudrama about the Hawaii-bound jetliner whose roof ripped off in flight, was No. 7.

The top-rated series was NBC's veteran barroom comedy "Cheers." ABC's newsmagazine "Primetime Live," starring Diane Sawyer and Sam Donaldson, was the No. 4 program.

ABC's "Roseanne" and NBC's "Wings" tied for fifth place. CBS' "60 Minutes" was eighth.

CBS' reality-based series "Rescue 911" and ABC's comedy program "Coach" tied for the No. 9 slot.
