A grand 4th around the land

Wouldn't you know? Teacher wins national hollering contest

JACKPOT — You can bet the students sitting in the back of Mary Alice Jacobson's classrooms can hear every word she says.

The elementary music teacher from Boise belted out 99 decibels in Shoshone Canyon south of Jackpot Thursday to win the 12th annual Carl Heyden Daze National Hollering Contest.

She led an all-woman sweep of the top three spots. Each woman said children are responsible for her voluminous vocals.

Second-place winner Margaret Halvorsen of Lake City, Iowa, is also a teacher. She has no trouble getting her students to pay attention, said Halvorsen, a two-time contest

winner and 11-time Iowa state hog calling champ.

The third-place finisher, Laura Egner of Filer, has two small children at home. Her holler was a come-home-and-do-your-chores message for her son.

Contestants were judged on volume, endurance — they could take only one breath during their holler, and their message.

Jacobson said her message — "Hold the old lady" — was meant as a safe-trip message for travelers. She admitted after the contest however, that she swiped the phrase from some Swiss yodelers she saw on television (teaching TV weatherman Willard Scott to yodel).

Veterans in spotlight on Uncle Sam's birthday

Floridians celebrated the Fourth of July by lighting a freedom flame, fog blurred a "dawn's early light" fireworks display in Southern California, and Americans everywhere got out the charcoal briquettes and hot dogs to mark Independence Day.

Emotions stirred by the Persian Gulf War added an extra-dimension to the nation's 215th birthday, which includes tributes to the troops and memorials to

those who died.

"I just feel like patriotism is a lot stronger now. I know it is with me," said Susan Wilkins of Midwest City, Okla., who wore an American flag in her hair as she watched the Oklahoma City parade. "I just wanted to support the troops as they go by."

Not everyone joined in the patriotic fervor.

About 500 anti-war protesters rallied before a parade honoring veterans in Portland, Ore. Police arrested five

demonstrators, including a woman who threw an egg.

In Kansas City, about 30 black, American Indians and homeless people denounced Fourth of July celebrations. Alonzo Washington, spokesman for the Black National Congress, said the nation remains divided by race and class.

"I can't celebrate independence if I have none," Washington said.

But celebrations outnumbered protests. The number of parade entries in Oklahoma City was nearly triple the

usual, organizers said. Bristol, R.I., which has been holding Independence Day parades for 206 years, included representatives of all military branches, dressed in everything from colonial militaria to Gulf War desert fatigues.

Philadelphia, the nation's birthplace, was able to plan a parade thanks in part to an unlikely source: the government of Kuwait, which chipped in \$10,000. A city commission awarded the Liberty Medal and its \$100,000 prize to former Costa

Troops in gulf lands celebrate in nearly traditional fashion

CHECKPOINT IMMINENT RETURN

U.S. troops in northern Iraq did their best to create a traditional July 4th, stoking up barbecues — shooting off fireworks and savoring beers — the first in months for some soldiers.

But there were plenty of reminders that they were far from home.

Troops had to instruct Kurds not to be alarmed by fireworks displays. "And Simon and Garfunkel's 'Homeward Bound' was a favorite of military disk jockeys, as was 'We Gotta Get Outta This Place' by The Animals."

"They're celebrating their country, their independence," said a young Iraqi working

as a translator at this checkpoint east of Zakho in the allied security zone. "I think it's a great day, because everybody wants to live in freedom."

The festivities were among several large holiday gatherings held by troops remaining in the region after the Persian Gulf War.

In Dubai, United Arab Emirates, hotels lined up all-American menus of steaks, hot dogs, hamburgers and beer and put on their liveliest jazz shows. The liner Cunard Princess in Bahrain took on 800 passengers, mainly troops based in Saudi Arabia, for a July 4th party.

Capt. David Mallard, a U.S. Army spokesman in Saudi Arabia, said many

Tension continues high over Slovenia border posts

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia — Federal troops withdrew to their bases Thursday, but a shaky truce faced a new test when the Yugoslav collective presidency demanded that Slovenia give up control of border posts.

Slovenian officials indicated they would not surrender the posts, which have become potent symbols of sovereignty for the breakaway republic. The federal army and Slovenian militia fought bitterly for control of them last week and on Tuesday.

The presidency demanded Slovenia

relinquish control of its borders by Sunday noon. It also ordered the republic to lift

and to withdraw its defense forces and release captured federal troops by midnight Thursday.

That deadline passed with no sign the republic had complied.

There was no call on Slovenian radio for troops to return from the field. Slovenian forces in the capital in fact began strengthening barricades Thursday night, replacing buses and trucks blocking streets with cross-tied iron girders fortified by

the collective presidency, which consists of representatives from Yugoslavia's six

republics and two provinces, issued its demands at an emergency meeting Thursday. Defense Minister Veljko Kauljovic also attended the meeting.

Slovenia refused to send its representative, and its leaders did not directly address the government's demands.

But Milan Kucan, president of the republic, accused the federal presidency of not being ready for dialogue.

Ullmanns lead to ultimatums, and then war follows," he said.

Ješko Kacin, the Slovenian information

minister, appeared to rule out return of the border posts. "Like it is impossible to awaken the dead, it is also impossible to restore the situation that used to exist in Slovenia," he said.

The five-member Slovenian presidency planned to meet overnight to discuss the demands. Yugoslavia's official Tanjug news agency reported.

Vasil Tupurkovski, Macedonia's representative on the federal presidency, said a ministerial-level European Community delegation probably would be invited to return to help mediate.

Iraq quandary: To resume or not to resume war against Saddam

WASHINGTON (AP) — It is July, but it could be last January. Once again, President Bush is delivering not-so-veiled ultimatums against Saddam Hussein.

It is almost enough to make one wonder whether Saddam knows that he lost a war.

Or whether the coalition that defeated him stopped too soon.

Saddam's defiance of the terms of the cease-fire he accepted and his refusal to permit U.N. inspection of nuclear facilities is raising the possibility that Bush may restart the war, at least long enough to assure the destruction of Iraq's ability to build crude, Nagasaki-power nuclear weapons.

Bush added: "He's trying to go away with something, national security adviser Brent Scowcroft said of Saddam."

Washington's community of foreign policy analysts — the city's unofficial corps of second guessers — seems agreed that renewed military action is at least possible, maybe even likely.

Some think the objective can be achieved with air power alone, or with air power plus special forces operations, the stealth units of ground warfare.

Some think that if war resumes, Saddam's removal from power should be the bottom-line objective.

Frank Gaffney, a former Reagan administration assistant secretary of defense, who represents a conservative viewpoint, thinks it may take another massive commitment of U.S. military force both to remove Saddam's troubling capability — and to remove Saddam himself, the only step, Gaffney says, that will assure stability.

"We could spend the next decade chasing around the Iraqi countryside trying to find, target and destroy not only his nuclear capability but also his chemical, biological and ballistic missile capabilities and we still would not have neutralized the latent problem that arises from his continued control of Iraq and his megalomaniac ambitions," Gaffney said in an interview.

Retired Gen. William Odom, former director of the National Security Agency, also thinks it would take an American ground force in Iraq to root out Saddam's destructive military capability at 20 or 30 known sites and "a bunch of suspect sites."

"If you put three or four divisions on the ground, I don't think the Iraqis would be eager to fight," said Odom.

If war resumes, said Adm. Thomas Moorer Jr., retired chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, it should not end this time until Saddam is out of power.

"He's got to go," Moorer said. "I don't think you will have any stability over there as long as he's there."

Three days into the war, Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf announced that Iraq's nuclear research reactors had been thoroughly damaged "and will not be effective for quite some number of years" — an assessment that turned out to be wrong.

Reports since then suggest "we missed a lot in our bombing raids,

perhaps getting only three out of seven or so facilities, and there's ample evidence that they (the Iraqis) moved both materials and equipment from those facilities before they were bombed," Paul Leventhal, a nuclear proliferation expert, said last week.

An Iraq defector also satisfied U.S. officials that Saddam was trying to hide nuclear facilities. When Iraqi soldiers fired shots into the air last week to halt U.N. inspectors, officials in Washington let out a word that the U.S. response might be to finish the job.

Those stories were "not all war-rantous," Bush said on Monday, and denounced Saddam anew.

"Everyone knows that the man was cheating and lying," Bush said. "Everyone knows that he did that

And he should give unfettered access to these inspectors, he didn't do that. He surreptitiously moved the equipment.

"All I'd say is he better get on with keeping his word, and he better get on with total, free open inspection."

"Bush is certainly playing the ambiguity game," said James A. Blackwell, Jr., military specialist at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.

"He acted this way just before Panama and just before the decision to commit U.S. forces to the Persian Gulf last Aug. 8 and to use force last Jan. 15," Blackwell said. "If Saddam is any student of George Bush, he ought to be getting really nervous right now."

AIDS to hit plateau in next 5 years

WASHINGTON (AP) — The steep rise in new AIDS cases in the United States will level off during the next five years due to a decline in infection rates and better treatment of early stages of the disease, a study says.

Ronald Brookmeyer, a professor of biostatistics at Johns Hopkins University, reports Friday in the journal Science that there has been a decline in the rate of infection by the human immunodeficiency virus, or HIV, that causes AIDS.

Additionally, he said, new therapies, such as the use of the antiviral drug AZT early in the infection and the use of inhaled pentamidine to

prevent an AIDS-caused pneumonia, will delay the time when HIV infection develops into full-blown AIDS.

The researcher estimated that the number of people diagnosed with AIDS in America will level off between 60,000 and 67,000 a year during the period 1990-1995.

The World Health Organization already estimates that the number of AIDS cases in North America and Western Europe will begin to level off around the middle of this decade, but its rise is predicted to continue in Africa with no plateau in sight.

As of last May 31, the Centers for Disease Control said there have been 179,136 Americans diagnosed with

AIDS since 1981. Brookmeyer estimates the number infected with the HIV virus but not diagnosed with AIDS to be about 1 million.

The scientist applied a new technique of back calculation that takes into account the changes in the incubation period of the HIV virus and the effect that new therapies have on delaying the disease's development into AIDS.

A person infected with the HIV virus may continue for years without going on to develop full-blown AIDS. The disease becomes AIDS when a patient contracts an opportunistic infection or develops other symptoms.

Teacher union chief calls for children's rights help

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Problem families should get at least as much attention as problem schools in efforts to reform education, the head of the nation's largest teacher union said Thursday.

Keith Geiger, opening the National Education Association's annual convention, accused President Bush and Congress of offering little but rhetoric in ensuring that children come to school healthy, well-fed and secure enough to learn.

That was one of six national education goals agreed upon nearly two years ago by Bush and the nation's 50 governors.

Geiger, president of the 2.1 million member union, said he planned to send Bush and every member of Congress parchment-style copies of a proposed "children's bill of rights" aimed at assuring that all youngsters come to school healthy enough to learn.

The proposed rights included adequate nutrition, medical care, a secure place to live, quality education and safeguards from abuse, violence or discrimination.

The government "cannot continue to be the 911 emergency number for the rest of the world, and refuse to be 911 for its own children," Geiger said in his speech before 8,100 teacher delegates.

Geiger, a former math and science teacher running unopposed for a second term as NEA president, urged accused Washington of skewed priorities.

In contrast to the Bush administration, which has stressed accountability as the "key to better schools," Geiger insisted that the school reform debate in the coming decade "will shift from schools to the family."

"I can guarantee our fellow citizens that schools are improving. It's childhoods that are not," he said.

TWIN FALLS — Wednesday night's Magic Valley race fans were treated to a pre-Fourth of July explosion of action at the Magic Valley Speedway.

It was Twin Falls' Night 20 50-lap main events in the street stock and Pro Stock divisions were the featured events and neither disappointed.

The only link in the night's festivities occurred in the Pro Stock main event when starter James Brady was struck by the car of Jeff Thompson during a red flag caused by a fire under the hood of Norm Huikie's car.

The evening started much like many in the past with Raleigh Curtis leading the winners circle right off the bat, taking the Pony Stock trophy.

Carl Marchello followed with his first win in the racing season in the Street Stock trophy dash. Lynn Baird, who collected his first win of the year in the Pro Stock trophy dash.

The action heated up in the first heat of the Pony Stock's Dwayne Wall, the division points leader, started near the back but slowly moved his way towards the front of the pack. On lap seven, of 10, Wall took advantage of the engine problem of raring teammate Curtis to take the lead and hold on for the checkered flag.

The second heat was won by Dennis Weeks in front of Doug Seant and Lance Thompson.

In the main event the yellow flag was out early. On the opening lap the caution flag fell twice, the second one taking pole-sitter Weeks out of contention.

Wall, who started the main event in seventh position, moved into the lead on lap five. From that point on it was a case of follow the leader with four cars racing in a tight single file to the finish.

"I like it," said Wall after winning the race and extending his points lead over the other drivers. "My tires started heating up and I tried to back off but I couldn't. I knew they were there."

Starter escapes serious injury when accidentally hit by racer

TWIN FALLS — What started as one of the most exciting evenings of the racing season turned to near tragedy Wednesday night for track starter James Brady when he was struck by the car of Jeff Thompson during a red flag caused by a fire under the hood of Norm Huikie's car.

The night was Twin Falls' Night 20 50-lap main events for the Street Stock and Pro Stock drivers.

But when Norm Huikie's No. 10 car spun and caught fire in turn one on the 20th lap of the Pro Stock main event a night of excitement turned to despair.

Huikie's car came to a stop at the top of the first turn which brought out a red flag, requiring the rest of the drivers to stop where they were. Pit crews quickly put out the small engine fire and everything appeared to be under control.

Because of the situation Brady left the flag stand to go on to the track to help. After the fire was put out he went over to the No. 11 car of Lynn Baird, which was stopped at the head of turn one. Brady bent over to check the underside of the car when Jeff Thompson, who had been in the pits and was now back on the track, came around Matlock on the backstretch. Matlock appeared to lose some power to his car and continued to drop back all the way to the sixth position.

At that point Lytle and Wilson began to open a sizable gap on the rest of the field. Matlock at the same time began his move back into contention.

Lap 28 saw Matt's move into the second position overtaking Wilson in turn three. On lap 30 Matlock moved his way back into third and the finish order was decided.

"It was rough," said Lytle in the winners circle. "I didn't know what I was doing 50 laps. My arms feel like rubber."

In the Pro Stock's Eddy McKean continued his domination of the division winning first in the heat race and then again in the main event.

In the main event McKean started next to last in the field of nine cars but wasted no time in getting his No. 88 car to the front of the pack. By lap five McKean had taken over the top position with everyone else left to run for second.

Willy Godby, Harold Wardell, Norm Hickey, and Chris Johnston all ran as a pack until lap 16 when Baird joined the group.

When racing resumed after Brady's injury at lap 20, track officials decided to shorten the race to a 15 lap event.

On the restart McKean jumped back out to a sizable lead over Godby. But on lap 32 McKean appeared to lose power.

"The car's getting hot," said McKean. "I didn't see him (Godby)."

McKean got back on the power on lap 33 just prior to a caution flag being thrown. After the green flag was dropped it became a sprint to the finish with McKean being the victor.

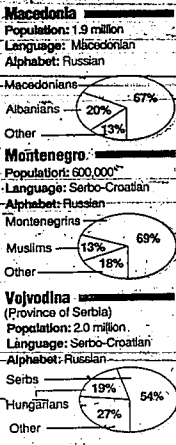

Gorbachev loses ally; party hurt

MOSCOW (AP) — The chances of a formal split in the Communist Party increased significantly Thursday.

That resulted from the resignation of Eduard Shevardnadze, a leader of the democratic reformers that Mikhail Gorbachev is trying to keep in the fold.

The former foreign minister announced his party membership as he angrily refused to submit to an internal investigation of his role in founding a democratic opposition movement. "Under no circumstances will I submit to such an investigation and kangaroo court, because if I agreed to it, I would be providing support... to the return of the Communist Party leadership to repressive methods of crushing dissent," said Shevardnadze, 63, in his resignation letter.

Boris Yeltsin, president of the Russian Federation, called Shevardnadze's decision a "personal matter" but said he believed many others would quit, too.

"That process will go pretty fast now. I think," said Yeltsin, who quit the party one year ago.

Fyodor Burlatsky, a prominent Soviet legislator and party member, predicted that the departure of an internationally respected figure like Shevardnadze could prompt the defection of about one-quarter of the party membership, which plummeted from 19 million to 16.3 million last year.

There was no immediate comment from Gorbachev, who indicated in a speech published Wednesday that he was still fighting to preserve the Communist Party's power and keep the reformist wing within it.

Shevardnadze and eight other leading reformers this week founded a democratic reform movement that could evolve into an opposition party challenging the Communists "that have ruled here since 1917."

The party Central Control Commission launched an "investigation" of his call for an opposition party and demanded he appear before the panel last Monday. He did not show up.

Commission spokesman Konstantin Kaehalin said Thursday the panel discussed Shevardnadze's case Monday but "since he is quitting the Communist Party, we are not going to take further action."

Iraqi opposition makes small gain

BAGHDAD, Iraq — The National Assembly passed a law Thursday that for the first time will permit opposition parties to operate, but they will not be able to amass much power.

The assembly speaker said the law eventually will lead to national presidential elections.

However, in a nation still ruled dictatorially by Saddam Hussein, the law comes with a few catches. For one, any new party must "appreciate the achievements" of Iraq's 1968 "revolution," the coup d'etat that brought the ruling Baath Party and Saddam to power.

The law forbids members of any party but Baath from joining the military and Saddam's much-feared security police. Most security police are already believed to be Baath members.

Mandela appears sole ANC candidate

DURBAN, South Africa — Nelson Mandela emerged as the lone candidate Thursday for presidency of the African National Congress, signifying the respect he commands from both militants and moderates in the organization.

Mandela, 73, holds the No. 2 post as deputy president but has effectively led the ANC since his February 1990 release from 27 years in prison. The current president, Oliver Tambo, has been in poor health since suffering a stroke two years ago and said he would not run for the post again.

Mandela's charisma, his good relationship with President F.W. de Klerk and his name recognition among South African youth have given him broad support among moderates and young militants and made him a natural for the presidency.

Doors fans break through to other side

PARIS — Fans of Jim Morrison pelted police with beer bottles and set a car on fire after smashing it through the main gate of the cemetery where the rock star is buried, police said Thursday.

Sixteen people were arrested and two police officers and a cemetery employee were slightly injured in the confrontation that ended early Thursday, police said.

Wednesday was the 20th anniversary of Morrison's death, in Paris from a drug overdose. A crowd of about 1,000 fans, mostly youthful and many seemingly intoxicated, gathered outside Paris' La Chapelle cemetery but were blocked from entering to visit Morrison's grave.

Most Scientologists acquitted of charges

MILAN, Italy — A Milan court has acquitted 67 Scientology followers of charges ranging from criminal association to tax evasion, but it convicted six others of deceiving confused people.

While not ruling that the group is a church, as Scientologists contend, the court said Wednesday that it is a non-profit organization and thus need not report to the Italian tax office. The trial was brought after a five-year investigation into activities of Scientology centers in Italy after disenfranchised followers filed lawsuits.

PEO agrees to stop battling army move

SIDON, Lebanon — Guns fell silent in Sidon Thursday evening after the PLO agreed to stop fighting the army deployment in the south and send all of its heavy weapons out of Lebanon, government and PLO officials said.

Guerrillas of the Palestine Liberation Organization had been fighting the Lebanese army since Monday, when the troops began trying to assert the government's authority in the south for the first time since civil war engulfed the nation in 1975.

"An agreement has been reached for a total solution," said Abdul-Jalil Amin, Cabinet minister without portfolio. "A new era has begun."

Kohl to talk tough with Gorbachev

FRANKFURT, Germany (AP) — Chancellor Helmut Kohl is expected to outline his tough stance on Yugoslavia and insist on Soviet economic reform at Friday's summit in Kiev with Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

Germany, like other western European nations, has hinted it may recognize the breakaway Yugoslav republics of Slovenia and Croatia.

If that were to happen, it would likely increase pressure on the West to back the independence claims of the Soviet republics of Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia.

Government sources in Bonn said Thursday the chancellor plans to tell

Gorbachev of European Community plans that include the possible imposition of economic sanctions to force Yugoslavia to settle its crisis peacefully.

Kohl and Gorbachev are to meet for four hours in the Ukrainian capital.

Their meeting comes 10 days before the Group of Seven industrial nations convene in London for an economic summit.

Gorbachev has been invited to London to talk with the summit participants, which include the United States and Britain, after their conference is over.

He is expected to appeal for more backing to help the Soviet Union switch to a free-market economy.

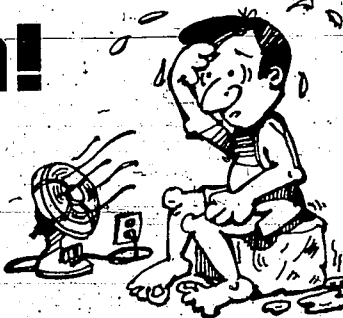
Germany has been the staunchest supporter of economic reform in the Soviet Union.

The Germans have pledged \$18 billion in assistance over five years, including bank guarantees to help rebuild the Soviet economy and resettle 380,000 Soviet soldiers withdrawing from east Germany.

But other industrial nations have not been so forthcoming, and Kohl is expected to tell Gorbachev to emphasize concrete economic reform plans to gain their support.

Sawtooth Forest enforces new hot springs rules

KETCHUM — The Sawtooth National Forest will enforce new rules on the use of Baumgartner and Frenchman's Bend hot springs this weekend.

A new law enforcement ranger, Joe Griffin, has been added to the SNF staff and will make regular patrols of the popular hot springs in the Fairfield and Ketchum ranger districts.

Both sites will be closed to the public after 10 p.m. and nudity and alcohol are prohibited. Violators may be issued citations and fined up to \$5,000.

"It's been fairly quiet so far," said Griffin. "But I anticipate a lot more people up there this weekend."

Restrictions on the use of the Baumgartner Hot Springs pool, located 12 miles east of Featherline on the South Fork of the Boise River, were announced earlier this week.

Unfortunately, because of a few unruly people, we have found it necessary to implement new rules for the use of this area," said Fairfield District Ranger John Madden.

"People were using the pool all hours of the night, drinking, and in general causing a disturbance in the campground."

The hot springs pool, which is located in Baumgartner Campground, will be closed to all use from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily. Nudity is prohibited and alcoholic beverages are banned from the pool area.

"Visitors refusing to abide by the rules will be cited," said Madden.

At Frenchman's Bend Hot Springs, eight miles west of Ketchum on Warm Springs Creek, the Ketchum Ranger District began enforcing similar restrictions in March. No citations have been issued, but use of the area has been limited.

Rowdiness, late-night parties and gunfire at Frenchman's Bend last summer prompted the new regulations.

Buhl business saves Pocatello fish plant

BUHL — A company formed by Buhl businessmen Ken Ellis and Kelly Stephens has bought part of Domsea Farms Inc., allowing its Pocatello fish processing plant to remain open.

Nez Perce Indians seek federal protection for noted chief's grave

NESPELEM, Wash. (AP) — The oldest male descendant of Nez Perce Indian Chief Joseph wants Congress to clear up his ancestor's crumbling, overgrown grave on a hilltop cemetery here.

Chief Joseph's great-grandnephew, 83-year-old Joe Redthunder, recently traveled to Washington, D.C., to ask Congress to expand the Nez Perce National Historic Site in Idaho to encompass 13 more sites, including the grave site in northeastern Washington and the grave of Chief Joseph's father in Joseph, Ore.

The historic site is currently made up of 24 parks, monuments and other attractions in Idaho.

Many Nez Perce say Joseph, whose most famous speech is about peace, not war, shouldn't be remembered only on battlefields, but in the place where he died in the lush Oregon home from which he was exiled.

The House and Senate are expected to hold hearings on Redthunder's request this summer.

Jeff Biggs, an aide to House Speaker Tom Foley, D-Wash., said he is too busy to predict whether the measure would pass. Foley's office sponsored Redthunder's trip to the Capitol. "I do know that Chief Redthunder made quite an impression," Biggs said. "And I think the representatives from Washing-

ton, Oregon, Idaho and Montana know how important Chief Joseph is to the people of the Northwest," Joseph, one of the best-known Indians in Northwest history, was a Nez Perce leader in 1877, when the government was trying to move the tribe to a reservation at Lapwai, Idaho.

Counseling for peace, Joseph led a faction of the tribe that refused to go. Although he favored diplomacy, Joseph led a strong military campaign when fighting broke out between his band and the whites over the move.

He led his band on a 1,300-mile, four-month march through parts of five states, defeating larger U.S. Army detachments at every turn.

Joseph finally surrendered near the Canadian border in central Montana after most of the other war chiefs had died. There he gave one of the most famous speeches in the history of the West: "I am tired, my heart is sick and sad. From where the sun now stands, I will fight no more forever."

Because they refused to accept Christianity, Joseph's band was later exiled from Lapwai. The band moved to Nespelem, on the Colville Reservation, where Joseph married two young widows and raised horses.

Firm making historic artificial hearts struggles to stay alive

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Less than nine years after dentist Barney Clark received a historic artificial heart implant, the company set up to manufacture the Jarvik mechanical heart is nearing liquidation.

Shareholders in Symbion Inc. will be asked at their meeting in Tempe next Thursday to approve a plan to dissolve the company, said Gary Cole, executive vice president and chief operating officer.

But the technology behind the plastic and metal devices pioneered by Symbion — devices that have been all but shelved since early '80s by the Food and Drug Administration — may not disappear with it, officials said.

Cole said the company announced its intention to sell or transfer its intellectual property to other groups. Negotiations are under way with officials at the universities of Arizona, and Utah, who want to acquire the rights jointly.

"We've asked the lady to marry me, but she hasn't said 'yes' yet," said Dr. Donald Olsen, an artificial heart researcher and director of the Institute for Biomedical Engineering at the University of Utah.

Dr. Jyck G. Copeland III, the University of Arizona researcher who pioneered use of the artificial heart as a temporary bridge to transplantation, said what makes the Symbion heart important "is it's the only show in the world right now."

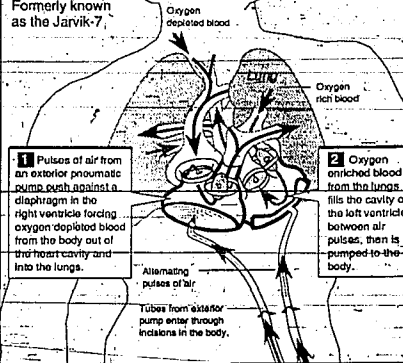
He said it's the only total artificial heart among all the types being researched that has any chance of being useful within the next few years. He also noted that the Symbion hearts have racked up thousands of days of use in patients.

"If the deal falls through, then I think the technology is going to be gone," he said. "I don't think that industry is going to pick it up."

Symbion was formed in Salt Lake City shortly after Clark's December 1983 operation there. Clark lived for 112 days on the device. Dr. Robert Jarvik, developer of the artificial heart used on Clark, was one of Symbion's original owners.

Only one other all-day total artificial heart has received federal approval for use in humans — Dr. William S. Pierce's Penn State heart.

Idaho's roads more deadly this year

BOISE — Twenty-one more people died on Idaho's roads in the first six months of this year than in the same period last year.

Idaho police fear the fatality rate will continue to increase over the Fourth of July holiday weekend. "As in the case of all major holidays, we will put all available officers on the road for this period," Col. Ron Moore of the Idaho State Police said Wednesday. As of June 30, 108 people had died in Idaho traffic accidents this year, compared to 87 last year, Moore said. That's a 24-percent increase.

Automated court system honored

BOISE — Idaho's pioneering court-computerization project was recognized in an award announced this week by the National Association for Court Management.

The Idaho Supreme Court received the 1991 honorable mention Justice Achievement Award for its four-year-old ISTARs system, scheduled to be operational in 32 counties by 1992. ISTARs, an acronym for Idaho Statewide Trial Court Automated Records System, automates all clerical and scheduling functions of trial courts, including the accounting of court-imposed fines, fees and restitution payments.

Paul man's name on troops monument

BOISE — A memorial dedicated to Idaho soldiers who served in Operation Desert Storm has been unveiled at Capitol Park despite a lack of funding.

As of Wednesday, \$152 in donations had been received for the \$700 memorial. But the maker of the monument is willing to wait for the payment, said Tom Black, who led efforts to establish the memorial.

More than 30 people watched as Parks Director Jim Thompson and Black, chairman of the local Operation Homefront chapter, uncovered the 18-inch-tall and 36-inch-wide granite monument.

The monument bears the names of three who died in the war: Capt. Paul R. Eichenlaub II and Capt. Douglas L. Bradt, stationed at the Mountain Home Air Force Base, and Sgt. Nels A. Moller, a native Idahoan from Paul, Pat Moller, the stepmother of Nels Andrew Moller, who died in a tank battle, said she appreciates the city's efforts to keep the memory of her stepson alive. "Andrew's a part of history," she said. "We're very proud of him."

Chevron workers punch hole in line

BOISE — Chevron tank farm workers punched a hole in a two-inch natural gas line, creating a small vaporous plume and what the company called an embarrassing situation.

The Intermountain Gas pipeline was repaired in 20 minutes and wasn't a hazard, John Martoccia, area supervisor for Chevron Pipe Line Co., said Wednesday.

But his workers violated a law that Chevron lobbied to have passed last winter, Martoccia said. The law, which was passed by the 1991 Legislature and went into effect Monday, requires excavators to notify utilities two days before any digging.

Oregon man sentenced on drug charge

ONTARIO, Ore. — An Ontario farmer convicted of cultivating tons of marijuana in his corn field has been sentenced to up to 11 years in prison.

Malheur County Circuit Judge F.J. Yraguen also ordered 59-year-old Eric Lee Gilliam to pay fines totaling \$3 million Wednesday.

AIDS Foundation encouraged after fire

BOISE — The Idaho AIDS Foundation might not have a permanent office until winter, a board member said.

"We did get several offers for space we're checking out. We're real encouraged," board member Mary Ann Seitz-Hart said Wednesday.

The foundation's office was damaged by a fire June 24 that investigators say was intentionally set. Seitz-Hart said people have donated a desk, a typewriter and an answering machine. Several churches also are considering lending temporary office space, but it may be six months until the foundation moves into a new home.

Trio tosses firecracker, injures man

SEATTLE (AP) — A trio who stopped to taunt a homeless man on a street corner and then set off a firecracker in his face laughed as they walked away from the injured man, a witness said.

Stacy Longhom, 20, said she was almost reduced to tears Tuesday night after two young men and a woman, who she described as dressed in nice clothes and looking well-to-do, blew up a firecracker in the face of James D. Bliss, 43.

"It was so evil. I couldn't believe that they just blew up a big firecracker on this poor guy, and then could go off laughing," she said.

Bliss was treated at Harborview Medical Center but escaped serious injury. The blast melted his baseball cap, covered his hands with burning phosphorus residue, and opened oozing wounds in his arm, police said. Police Officer Cecilia Doucet said it could have been much worse. She said the firecracker was a powerful M-80, which is like a small stick of dynamite and has blown off limbs.

No arrests were made.

Longhom said she knows Bliss from seeing him on the streets near her apartment. She said he is a harmless, friendly, down-on-his-luck construction worker from Reno, Nev. She said Bliss's tormentors were drunk and acting irresponsibly and violently.

Bliss, on the other hand, reacted to the incident with true American goodness, Longhom said. "He was thanking me as he was being put in the ambulance," she said.

Sewage fouls river

SPOKANE (AP) — The sewage system that serves several British Columbia towns broke down this week and has been dumping millions of gallons of raw sewage into the Columbia River just north of the Washington border.

The sewage system for Trail, Roseland and Warfield has been running at half capacity since a rock and piece of wood damaged a pump on Sunday, flooding the pump station. The problem was discovered Monday morning and was expected to be repaired Friday, Trail city engineer Ted Walton said.

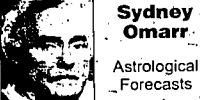

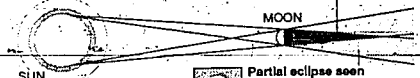
Why do solar eclipses happen?

The two most prominent astronomical objects, the sun and the moon, have about the same apparent size in the sky (about one-half degree in diameter). This happens because the sun, 400 times larger than the moon, also is 400 times farther away.

Total vs. partial solar eclipses

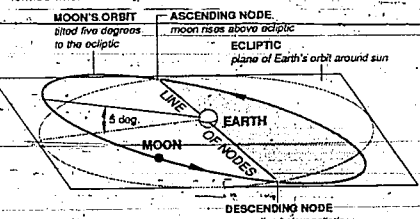
A total solar eclipse happens only if the umbra, or dark part, of the moon's shadow touches the Earth.

Total eclipse seen from umbra
observer here sees no part of the sun.

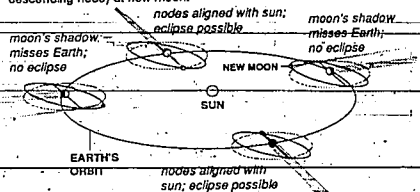


Why isn't there an eclipse every month?

If the moon, Earth and sun all moved in the same plane, there would be a solar eclipse at every new moon, and a total eclipse at every full moon. Actually, the plane of the moon's orbit around the Earth is inclined to the plane of the Earth's own orbit around the sun. The line formed where the two planes cross is called the *line of nodes*.



The moon's shadow can only hit the Earth to cause an eclipse if the moon is crossing the plane of the ecliptic (at an ascending or descending node) at new moon.



July 11 solar show eclipsing 'em all

The longest total solar eclipse in the next 141 years will dramatically darken the skies July 11 over a narrow, 9,300-mile-long swath of the Earth.

Eagerly anticipated because of the unusual duration of "totality" — up to six minutes, 53 seconds near Mexico's Baja California peninsula — the eclipse has already generated a frenzy of advance sales and booked-solid accommodations in prime viewing areas.

"It's one of the most awe-inspiring events you'll ever see," said Ed Hinkle, astronomer Glenn Schwartz, an admitted "eclipsophile" who has traveled worldwide to view 14 total solar eclipses in the past two decades.

But the path of totality — the shadow of the moon as it streaks across the Earth — will cover less than 1 percent of the surface, measuring only 139 miles wide as the eclipse begins in the Pacific Ocean west of Hawaii just after sunrise on July 11.

Some of the best viewing is expected on the island of Hawaii. To the delight of astronomers, the total eclipse will occur at 7:30 a.m. Hawaiian time, lasting 4 minutes, 10 seconds — over the world's largest array of observatories, atop the extinct Mauna Kea volcano.

For a total of three hours, 26 minutes, the shadow will travel across the Pacific to the Gulf of California, reaching Baja and an estimated 100,000 "eclipse-watchers" around noon. It then comes down over Central America, Colombia, and Brazil.

The duration of the eclipse will vary from area to area because the length depends on the size of the shadow and the speed at which it moves across the Earth.

An area 2,200 miles on either side of the shadow's path will see a partial solar eclipse of varying darkness. It is a bit of celestial magic that solar eclipses occur at all. The Moon — 400 times smaller than the

Sun — just happens to be 400 times closer to the Earth, so they appear about the same size in the sky.

And if the right combination of positions takes place as our planet and its moon travel in their orbits, the Moon will appear large enough to block the entire Sun, giving observers within the path of totality a rare view of the star's ethereal outer atmosphere, the corona.

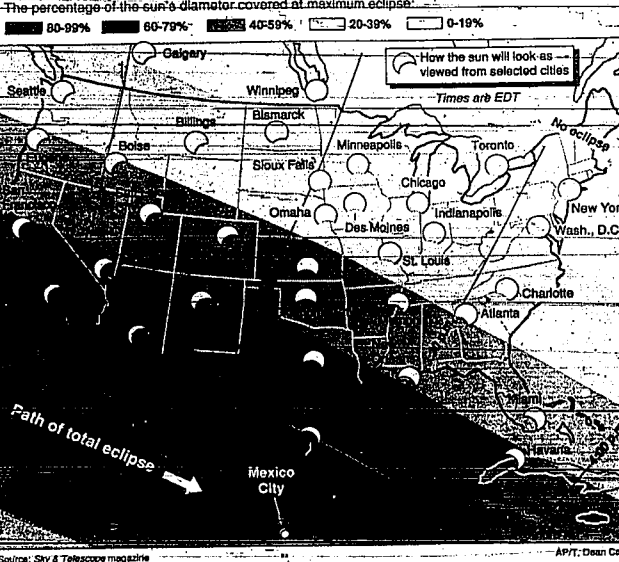
A solar eclipse occurs somewhere on Earth two to five times a year, with a maximum of three total eclipses. Historically, about 28 percent have been total, 35 percent partial and 37 percent "annular," when the Moon is properly aligned for a total eclipse but its apparent size is not quite big enough to cover the whole disk.

path is so narrow, any particular place on Earth will experience a total solar eclipse only once in 360 years. Since so much of the surface is ocean, many are visible only in inaccessible or inconvenient locations.

"The location of the (July 11) path puts more people in the Moon's shadow than any other eclipse in history," said Alan Dyler, associate editor of *Astronomy* magazine, who predicts that more than 40 million people will see the "eclipse of the decade."

In fact, the upcoming total solar eclipse is the last for almost 20 years to be visible from somewhere in the United States and the fourth longest in the 20th century, a mere 15-seconds shy of the longest on June 20, 1955, at 7 minutes, 8 seconds.



Author offers cash to get book read

CHENEY, Wash. (AP) - Author David Zane offers prospective readers a little incentive - money - to take a new book.

Thirty-eight people gathered at Eastern Washington University last weekend to take a 128-page exam on Zane's 762-page book, "Oh! Downtrodden."

The 69-year-old San Francisco author agreed to pay each a minimum \$200 to read the novel. Zane explored topics as diverse as homosexuality, education, love and logic.

Depending on their test scores, readers could pocket even more money from a \$19,000 prize pool that Zane has established with his own money.

Zane wrote the book in the late 1960s, though it wasn't published

until 1975. It was first conceived as a defense of homosexuality but eventually "included all Zane's opinions on hundreds of subjects.

Sales have been slow. Zane doesn't hide the fact he holds the contests in hopes of finding a potential market for his work.

"I'll do everything I can to get this word read," Zane said.

"I think the idea of paying readers to read my book is a new kind of marketing and acting-up."

Most took the test last Saturday but some didn't leave until Sunday, taking as long as 32 hours to finish the 1,700-question exam.

Readers were allowed to take breaks and meals were provided.

Zane has administered similar tests in San Francisco and hopes to sponsor one in Ohio in December.

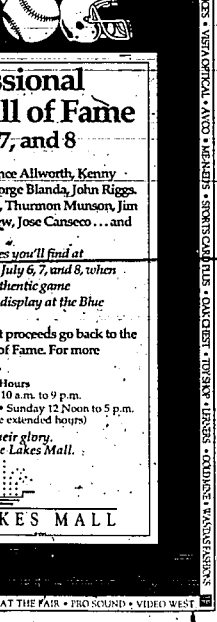

'Terminator 2' revels in special effects

It is easy to see where all the money went in "Terminator 2: Judgment Day." The film cost about \$80 million, and most of that, apparently, went into the special effects. The money was well-spent. These are very special special effects, but that's about all the film is, special effects.

A sequel to the original "The Terminator" released in 1984, the new film is 2 hours and 14 minutes of car, truck, bike and anything else that crashes on the movie. Machines leap tall buildings and burst into flame. Cars batter each other until the spectator feels as though he is at an amusement park. When the machines are not exploding, the guns are.

"Terminator 2" may include the largest and most varied arsenal ever employed in one film, and that includes "The Longest Day."

The movie does a lot. It needs more, but we'll have to make do.

In the first film, Arnold Schwarzenegger played an evil alien, visiting our globe to murder the woman who would give birth to the boy who would grow to be the man who would lead earthlings in their battle against alien hordes.

On his trail was another alien boy, but this was a good one, here to save the mother and the boy.

In the sequel, Schwarzenegger's character has been reformed, or re-programmed. This time, he is the good cyborg, and Robert Patrick is the bad cyborg, here to kill the kid and, if necessary, his mother.

You should know this going in. If you don't, you may waste valuable time wondering why Schwarzenegger has the jokes, why he handles Patrick and Patrick, the killing chore. When the original film appeared, critics saw similarities to a holy birth, with Linda Hamilton passing as a kind of holy Madonna.

No such chance in the second film. Linda Hamilton, as the boy's mother (he's now about age 12 in the new film) swears like Eddie Murphy and is as tough as Charles Bronson. Special effects will certainly take to this one. However, those who think that one gunfight is pretty much like another, that one motorcycle flying through the air is pretty much like all cycles doing the same, may find the film a bit repetitious.

Some of the special effects are close to those used in "The Abyss," which should come as no surprise because both films were directed by James Cameron, who also did the first "Terminator."

You might, in fact, call "Terminator 2" (rated R) the "Son of Abyss," particularly when the evil cyborg changes watery shape.

'Terminator' producers spend big bucks

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Terminator 2: Judgment Day," the sequel to the hit 1984 Arnold Schwarzenegger science-fiction movie, opened Wednesday as the most expensive movie ever made.

Reports have circulated that the Carolo Pictures production climbed to \$90 million or even \$100 million, which would have had its own cash-flow problems, but the unofficial figure has been placed at \$88 million.

According to The Boston Globe, Carolo sent a memo to Wall Street analysts detailing the movie's costs and revenue projections. "The May 30 memo put the actual cost of producing the effects-laden, action-cramped epic at a mere \$51 million, about what the summer's two other biggest action pictures, "Robin Hood, Prince of Thieves and "Hudson Hawk" cost," the Globe said.

The latest Terminator was being released in time for the Fourth of July weekend. The costliest movies to date were "Die Hard 2" and "Who Framed Roger Rabbit," each at \$70 million, according to Exhibitor Relations Co.

The 1963 movie "Cleopatra" cost \$40 million, and in today's dollars, it would have cost more than \$100 million.

Among the reported costs of "Terminator 2," \$15 million, including a \$1.5 million Gulfstream G-III jet for Schwarzenegger, and \$2 million for writer-producer-director James Cameron. An additional \$10 million reportedly was paid to Hemdale Film Corp. for remake rights.

It is also estimated, according to the Globe, that Tri-Star Pictures will spend \$20 million to \$25 million to market and distribute the movie.

The first "Terminator" cost \$6.4 million and grossed \$35 million in domestic sales. The sequel would require a minimum gross of more than \$200 million worldwide to break even.

According to The New York Times, Carolo scheduled 800 stuntman days, spending \$11 million. By comparison Steven Spielberg's "Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom" had about 350 stuntman days, the Times said. Both movies were filled with non-stop action. "Terminator 2" has motorcycle chases, fights and well-coordinated leaps and jumps.

There's also a chase along a concrete river bed involving a low-flying helicopter and a huge truck that flies off bridges. All went well, Cameron said, except for the rollover of a huge tanker truck.

"Nobody was hurt, but it did go past six of my seven cameras," the director said. "We did get a beautiful shot on the seventh camera, and I supplemented that with some model shots and so on."

"Terminator 2" makes use of a new film technology called digital processing. The technology allows filmmakers to do all sorts of tricks, such as craning wires and harnesses from stunt scenes.

In one scene, Schwarzenegger's motorcycle leaps over a wall. The stunt actually was filmed with Schwarzenegger's stunt double sitting on the bike as it was slowly pulled over the wall. Digital processing made it look like the action shot the audience sees.

Booklet deals with electronics questions

How many TV sets were sold in the United States last year? The number of households now have VCRs and camcorders? When did Sony's Walkman debut? The answers to these questions and many others concerning the \$33 billion consumer-electronics business can be found easily in one booklet.

A handy summary of the industry's product sales and trends that's available free to the public. It's put out by the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group.

Published annually by the trade organization, "The U.S. Consumer Electronics Industry in Review," recently appeared in its 1991 edition. For numbers addicts, it's an indispensable statistical snapshot of sales in all sorts of product areas: audio and video components, satellite dishes,

computers, telephones, home office equipment and more.

The EIA's numbers are regarded as the most authoritative in the field. They represent "factory sales" (sales to dealers) from more than 60 companies, including JVC, Mitsubishi, Panasonic, Sanyo Fisher, Sony, Tascam (RCA and GE brands) and Zenith.

The total \$33 billion in sales estimated by EIA is worth \$44 billion at retail. The sales data, shown in table form giving units sold and dollar value for scores of products, is the backbone of the booklet. But even casual readers with an interest in home electronics can enjoy the concise narrative "Origin and History of Consumer Electronics," touching on topics from the tumbable and crystal set to transistors and semiconductors.

There are separate product narratives as well, with most falling under

the two broadest headings of audio and video. Some products, such as still video cameras, rate just a couple of paragraphs.

On the other hand, there's a thorough discussion cover TV and the status of high-definition TV, a product that as yet exists only in the research labs.

Rounding out the booklet is an altering chronology of notable dates in the industry. Did you know that in 1910, Enrico Caruso broadcast by "radio-phonograph" from backstage at the Metropolitan Opera? The EIA also maintains an array of pamphlets such as "How to Buy a Personal Computer" and "How to Choose, Use and Care for Audio and Video Tape."

The complete list, including some films and videotapes, is given in the "Review." Single copies are usually free. Prices and ordering information for multiple copies of pamphlets and

videocassettes are given in an appendix.

There's also a list of phone numbers and addresses for associated trade organizations — electronics engineers, retail dealers, broadcasters and so on — as "additional information sources."

Oh, by the way, here are the answers to those questions in the first paragraph: Manufacturers sold 21 million TV sets in 1990, 74 percent of U.S. homes have a VCR and 15 percent have a camcorder, and Sony introduced its Walkman in 1979.

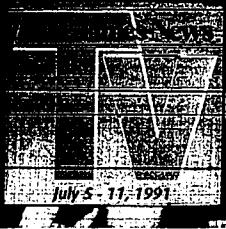

Friendly confines of Skydome doesn't guarantee slugfest for All-Star Game

Last year's All-Star Game was slated to be a real slugfest. Take such players as Jose Canseco, George Bell and Cecil Fielder from the American League and Will Clark, Andre Dawson and Kevin Mitchell from the National League, and you'd expect to see plenty of baseballs launched into the bleachers, especially in the "friendly confines" of Chicago's Wrigley Field.

You would have been wrong. Not one home run was hit. And the only runs in the game came from a double by the Texas Rangers' Julio Franco. The American League won the pitching-dominated game, 2-0.

In the All-Star Game, just because it's a hitter's park doesn't mean you'll see a lot of runs, explains Tim McCarver, who, along with Jack Buck, is describing the action at the "62nd All-Star Game," broadcast live from Toronto's Skydome, Tuesday, July 9, on CBS. "Wrigley is a hitter's park, and look what happened last year. And the Skydome is a hitter's park. But you have to wait and see."

What may be the norm during regular-season play doesn't necessarily apply to what can happen in an All-Star Game. "There are always inequalities," McCarver points out. "Last year's game was a pitcher's game. And it only makes sense that the pitchers are strong. Hitters haven't batted against the pitchers (from the opposite league), and remember, they only throw for three innings, tops."

McCarver doesn't hold with what

he calls the "party line," or the "we have to win" attitude that the front-office types exhibit. "Players get to unleash all the tensions of the season and just have fun," he says. "I don't care what anybody tells you."

And he should know what he's talking about. McCarver was an All-Star catcher for the St. Louis Cardinals in 1966 and 1967. In 1966 he singled and scored the winning run for the National League in the 10th inning. McCarver played major-league baseball for 21 seasons, primarily with the Cardinals (he was on their world championship teams of 1964 and 1967) and the Philadelphia Phillies. He played briefly for the Montreal Expos and Boston Red Sox as well.

Midway through this season, McCarver says he sees a few surprises around the league, but he also sees a few things that he expected.

"Oakland has been a surprise in many ways," he says. "With all the injuries and everything, I think Tony LaRussa has done a great job."

(LaRussa is the manager of the American League team in this year's outing, while Lou Piniella of the world champion Cincinnati Reds is managing for the National League.)

Soap opera scene

Michael Corbett: The 2-faced villain

Summertime means "spice it up" for the youngsters on "The Young and the Restless." That nasty fellow David Kimble, who schemed to take Nina for everything, including her wealthy son Phillip, is loose again.

A plastic surgeon was supposed to change David's face so villainy could operate again, but the clever fellow played a trick, carving out the word "killer" on David's forehead. A makeup artist managed to cover up the damage with the use of prosthetics and a wig. The artist was so good not even Nina could recognize her former husband during a test run.

A specialist in portraying villains on "Ryan's Hope" and "Search for Tomorrow," before joining "Y & R" in '86, Michael Corbett does double duty this summer, playing the scheming Kimble, and one Jim Adams, a bold Texas with blue eyes, the fellow with the new nose, new skin, new hair-do and contact lens. But no makeup man can redo Kimble's black beard that now beats for Adams.

"We have more going on than just chase, revenge and skunk scheming," says Michael. "With Jim we're going to have a summer of love and lust. A neat twist to the usual disguise story."

Judging by the number of hours Corbett spends at CBS running from makeup to the stage and back to makeup, the actor ought to live there. According to Michael, it only takes makeup artist Mark Loundon, an Emmy Winner, three hours for Corbett to become Jim Adams. When the Adams' segment is finished for the day, Corbett must rush back to makeup, take off the disguise, and put on the David Kimble scarred face. He spends more time in makeup than he does on the set.

The other day, Corbett as Jim Adams sat down next to his best friend on the show, Jill's Jess Walton, and she didn't recognize Corbett. The Adams character had yet to appear on camera! Later, Corbett was in the soap's offices, and one of the workers eyed him with suspicion, a newcomer sitting where he shouldn't.

Michael doesn't mind all those painstaking hours in makeup because he can play somebody else for a change. "Soaps usually cast an actor according to his appearance. Seldom do you have a chance like this. I walk

differently, try new gestures and am taking voice lessons to speak a South Texas drawl correctly. That's what this acting business is all about."

The increased workload for Corbett comes at a propitious time for him. On the side the actor dabbles in real estate, buying, renovating and selling properties. It started at the age of 9 when Corbett took pictures of people's houses and turned a profit.

Today, when the real estate business on both coasts is lousy, Corbett concentrates on acting. "Some day real estate will bounce back," he says. "I think the market has already hit bottom. In the long run you can't beat owning land, particularly in California."

Does David Kimble have this thought in the back of his criminal mind?

Daytime Emmys win big in nighttime

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The first nighttime broadcast of the daytime Emmy awards was the No. 2 show on television last week and helped give CBS a first-place finish in the latest network ratings race.

Thursday's two-hour presentation of the 18th Annual Daytime Emmys was the only non-repeat in a top 10 list populated by summer reruns.

CBS won the week with a 9.6 average rating, followed by NBC with 8.7. ABC was third with 8.5. Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

The No. 1 show was the CBS newsmagazine "60 Minutes."

ABC's blue-collar comedy "Roseanne" was third, followed by the doings of a small Arkansas town depicted in CBS' "Evening Shade."

"Coach," which follows ABC's successful "Roseanne," was No. 5.

NBC's usually top-rated "Cheers" dropped to No. 6, followed by CBS' tough-talking-TV journalist "Murphy Brown."

"Empty Nest," part of NBC's hit Saturday night lineup, was No. 8.

In a three-way tie for ninth place were ABC's "Family Matters," NBC's "Golden Girls" and CBS' long-running mystery vehicle for

Production problems stall 'Family Dog'

HOLLYWOOD - A new series of production problems on "The Family Dog," the animated TV series from two of Hollywood's most powerful feature film directors - Steven Spielberg and Tim Burton - has once again stalled CBS' drive to put an animated program in prime time.

Last month, the two executive producers quietly laid off the series' remaining production and animation staff, at one time 75 members strong. Now they are dismissing the services of Wang Film Productions, the massive animation house in Taiwan that animated the designs of the "Family Dog" staff.

Spielberg and Burton were reportedly unhappy with what they saw after viewing the first completed

batch of "Family Dog" episodes that arrived from Taiwan last month, sources said.

"The comedy was bland," said one source close to the production. "The sharpness of the humor and the dog's personality were not captured through the animation—it was not up to snuff. It looked like a play that needed a few more rehearsals. With animation, lots of luck."

Spielberg and Burton have apparently asked Nelvana Productions in Toronto to make fixes in the much-hyped and long-awaited series, budgeted at \$600,000 per episode and built around the odd-looking dog that Burton created several years ago as a student of the California Institute for the Arts in Los Angeles.

Burton has a strong relationship with the Canadian animation house,

which can handle the work in-house. (Generally, storyboards and main character poses are done by staff animators with the detailed animation work completed overseas, where labor is cheaper.) Nelvana is producing animated versions of Burton's stylized film "Beetlejuice" as a Saturday-morning series for ABC and a weekday series for Fox.

"Nelvana has always supported the vision of CBS and Tim Burton," said Nelvana spokeswoman Hayley Sumner. "Together, CBS and (Spielberg's) Amblin Entertainment have chosen Nelvana to enhance their project. Nelvana will be completing all the shows for 'The Family Dog'."

CBS declined to comment on the situation, but Amblin confirmed that the series is being sent to Nelvana for "fixes and completions."

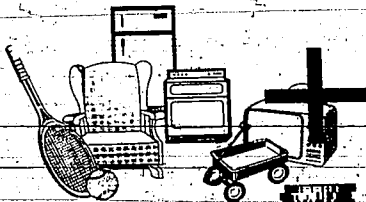
