Senate pay hike angers activists

WASHINGTON — Consumer and conservancy activists howled in outrage Thursday at what one called a "pre-midnight raid on the Treasury" by the Senate in voting itself a \$23,200 pay raise.

At least three members said they would refuse the money or give it to charity.

Well after the evening news shows, with few reporters in the Capitol and on a day when a nuclear arms agreement and an economic summit would dominate headlines the next morning, the Senate voted late Wednesday night to boost member salaries nearly 23 percent.

Approved 53-45, the provision would close the gap between the \$125,100 annual salaries that the 435 House members have been collecting since last January and the \$101,900 that senators get.

Idahoans defend increase

WASHINGTON — Sen. Steve Symms said he didn't vote himself a raise Wednesday.

"This is not a pay increase," said Symms, an Idaho Republican who joined a majority of senators late Wednesday in voting themselves a \$23,200 pay hike. "It simply stops

senators from augmenting their salaries with speaking fees, instead setting taxpayer-supported Senate salaries at the same level as salaries of House members."

The raise, \$446.15 per week, was approved by the Senate 53-45 and boosts senators' salaries to the same \$125,100 as received by House members but bans honoraria, or

The raise would be coupled with a renunciation of fees for speeches to special interest groups now accepted by nearly two-thirds of the senators. Those honoraria now are limited to \$27,337 a year for Senate leaders and \$23,068 for others.

Some frequent performers on the rubber chicken speaking circuit actually could get an honoraria windfall this year.

Those who have already pocketed the \$23,068 limit on honoraria this year could make a total of \$134,364 in pay and speaking fees together in 1991 if the legislation is finished and signed by President Bush before Congress goes on vacation next month.

"Obviously, the senators are ashamed of what they are doing," said consumer advocate Ralph Nader, who for three decades has spearheaded grassroots revolts against pay increases for lawmakers. He called the vote a "pre-midnight raid on the Treasury."

Current Senate salaries are already 4% times the average family income of Americans. Please see SENATE/A2

Vandals leave cemetery a mess

HEYBURN — Almost three dozen headstones have been tipped off their bases at the Riverside Cemetery in the past 72 hours, leaving cemetery officials with a rising bill and law enforcement officials with an unsolved case of vandalism.

Twenty-five headstones were tipped off their bases at Riverside Cemetery in Heyburn Wednesday night and 10 were tipped over Tuesday night, said Heyburn Chief of Police Robert Vasquez.

Vasquez said police have no leads, but the investigation is continuing.

He said none of the vandalized headstones was broken, but he said that whoever did the tipping used some sort of tool to pry the heavy headstones off their bases.

But Alford Harrell, the cemetery's sexton, said he thinks kids could be tipping over the headstones by leaning on them.

"I hope they catch whoever is doing this and prosecute them to the fullest extent," Harrell said. "This is costing a small fortune."

Memorial Monument in Burley used a backhoe to place the headstones back on their bases.

According to Harrell, the business is charging \$25 a headstone, which the cemetery has to pay.

Tim Harris, manager of Memorial Monuments, said

headstones, which weigh between 400 and 500 pounds, often are the subject of vandalism.

"Most every year we're out placing headstones somewhere," he said. "Most recently, before Heyburn, we were at the Rupert cemetery."

Harris said that during the last week in March the company lifted 12 headstones back onto their bases at the Rupert cemetery. He said none of them were broken.

Last year, vandals hit the Huley cemetery, Harris said, and about four years ago Memorial Monuments attended to some vandalized headstones in Wendell.

The Heyburn cemetery was the victim of vandalism several years ago.

Vasquez said a juvenile and an 18-year-old took two headstones from the cemetery, but the stones later were recovered.

"It seems like this kind of thing happens at least one to two times a year, and usually it is done by kids who have a lack of respect," Harris said.

"What I'm hoping is that if people are driving by a cemetery, at night especially, they would be more aware," he said. "There really isn't much that should be going on in a cemetery at night anyway."

Vasquez said some of the cemetery's sprinkler heads were broken off on Wednesday night as well.

Americans fat, lazy but driving better

ATLANTA — A new survey of American behavior finds some healthy trends on the road — more seat-belt use and less drinking and driving — but less good news at home.

"We're still about as fat and lazy as we were."

The National Centers for Disease Control reported Thursday its latest annual survey of the unhealthy things Americans do, the "behavior risk factor" survey of 39 states plus Washington, D.C.

The state-by-state results, compiled from monthly random phone interviews conducted in 1989, don't add up to a national sample. But they do show some states adopting healthier habits and others, with more than a little room for improvement.

Twenty-eight states showed a decrease in the percentage of people ignoring their seat belts, compared to the previous year's study. And residents of 21 states reported less drinking and driving.

But just 13 states reported improvements in exercise habits. And while 24 states reported a drop in the prevalence of overweight people, 14 of those states, the decreases were less than 1 percent.

The percentages of respondents overweight ranged from 16 in New Mexico to 29 in Pennsylvania.

Vietnam claims it gave U.S. remains of man allegedly shown in MIA photo

WASHINGTON — Vietnam says it handed over remains last year of one man purported to be in a more recent picture of missing American servicemen, but analysis later showed the bones were not human, the Pentagon said Thursday.

Ten sets of remains were given over by the Vietnamese government in April 1990, Pentagon spokesman Pete Williams said. Han identified one of the sets of remains as those of Air Force Col. John Leighton Robertson.

"We have been unable to conclusively determine the identity of those remains," Williams said. "That's not an unusual case."

But the Pentagon said later that the "set of remains was subsequently determined to be nonhuman, and the Vietnamese were so notified in July 1990."

Robertson's name and the names of two other American flyers, Air Force Maj. Albro Lynn Lundy Jr. and Navy Lt. Larry James Stevens, have been linked to a grainy photograph that their families say shows the three men alive and still in Southeast Asia.

Robertson and Stevens were listed as missing in action, and Lundy was listed as killed after the three were shot down in separate incidents more than 22 years ago.

Later all three were declared killed in action, but their bodies were not recovered, the Pentagon said late Thursday.

Intelligence analysts have been examining the photograph since the Pentagon obtained its first poor copy in September 1990, but the results so far have been inconclusive.

Williams said that, without corroborating evidence, the Pentagon may never be able to say whether the photo is genuine.

"We may never have a very definitive view of that picture, but that ... isn't preventing us from giving it the best analysis that we can or treating it very seriously because the family members in question feel ... the picture is pictures of — images of their relatives," he said.

For former mayor, 8 years may be enough

TWIN FALLS — Eight years in city government might have been enough for Councilman Doug Vollmer.

Vollmer, who also served as mayor from 1986 through 1989, said Thursday that he is considering not seeking re-election to a third, four-year term this fall. But his decision hinges partly on who might replace him.

"If there is someone out there who is competent and wants to serve, I'm willing to step aside," Vollmer said. "It's good to have change periodically."

But he did not rule out running again if nobody else who's qualified wants the job.

Councilman Art Frantz, who is finishing his first four-year term, said Thursday he plans to run again, although he agreed with Vollmer that government needs new blood periodically.

The most important issue facing the city is the proposal organ-

izers want to put on the November 1992 ballot to turn property taxes back to 1 percent of market value.

"This could mean a complete, in essence, revision of budgeting," Frantz said.

If the initiative makes it into law, cities

must have a local option to generate funds, such as the local-option tax, Frantz said.

Councilman Gale Kleinkopf's and Mayor Tom Condit's seats also are up for re-election this year. Neither of those two could be reached for comment on their plans Thursday.

Prospective candidates have until Oct. 8 to file petitions to run. The petitions can be picked up at City Hall, Deputy City Clerk Sharon Bryan said.

The petitions must contain the signatures of at least 40 registered voters living within the city limits. Nobody may sign more than one petition for each of the four council seats up for election.

Petitions can be turned back to Bryan only between Sept. 26 and Oct. 8.

Photo latest twist in long search for MIAs

BANGKOK Thailand (AP) — Swindlers, Ramboes and true believers have all engaged in the frustrating hunt for Americans missing in Indochina.

Now a grainy photograph is raising hopes that three of the fliers are still alive.

The photograph shows the faces of three men, purportedly Americans still being held prisoner in southeast Asia, who appear to be holding up a sign reading: "Photo LD 25.5.1990" and "NNTRK! K.S.E. 19."

The numbers could be the date May 25, 1990.

U.S. intelligence analysts who have studied the photograph for nine months say they cannot verify its authenticity. The relatives of the men pictured are convinced it's real, even though the 10-year hunt has yielded no POWs thus far.

"There's no doubt in anyone's mind that they are who they are," said American Albro L. Lundy III, who claims the picture shows his father, an Air Force flier shot down over Laos in September 1966.

Lundy, who held a news conference in Los Angeles Wednesday with relatives of the other men believed in the picture, said he had the photo analyzed and early results indicated it was genuine.

"Although he would not elaborate on the analysis, Lundy claimed the picture shows the men just as they would have aged over time. Today his father would be 58.

The photograph was obtained by the Pentagon in September 1990 and

came from the American Defense Institute, an organization in Alexandria, Va., which has previously made claims of MIA sightings.

U.S. government authorities have charged that the organization has made false claims in the past to raise money.

The disclosure of the photo is the latest twist in a long hunt for MIAs that has involved official U.S.-Vietnam and U.S.-Laotian searches, "Rambo-style" forays into Laos by ex-jungle fighters, dedicated patriots trying to piece together tiny clues and swindlers preying on the emotions of relatives who cling to hope.

Although the United States does not exclude the possibility of POWs remaining alive, government officials concede that this is unlikely. They note that most "live sighting" reports prove to be insubstantial or fraudulent.

The Pentagon lists 2,274 Americans as missing in action in the war, including 1,657 in Vietnam, 528 in Laos, 83 in Cambodia and six in

Chinese coastal waters.

The Communist nations have repeatedly denied holding any Americans.

Yet over the years, private efforts have been waged with millions of dollars in contributions from donors, including heiress Gloria Vanderbilt, movie stars Clint Eastwood and Charlton Heston and billionaire H. Ross Perot.

Some of the private searches appear to be dedicated and honest; others are not.

All believe they need to take the matter into their own hands because they claim the U.S. government has not done enough.

"I'm afraid only God, the mothers and the Special Forces want them back," said ex-Green Beret James "Bo" Gritz, who staged several unsuccessful commando-style forays into Laos in the 1980s.

His activities were curbed after U.S. authorities charged him with using a passport under a false name during his trips to Southeast Asia.

Bulgaria reports fire in nuclear plant warehouse

SOFIA, Bulgaria (AP) — A fire broke out in a warehouse near a reactor at Bulgaria's high-risk Kozlevar nuclear power plant, but no radioactive contamination escaped, officials said Thursday.

The fire occurred Monday evening in a storage facility for clothes, plastic bags and other materials used at the power plant, but it was not made public until Thursday.

The storage area is near one of the two aging Soviet-designed reactors scheduled to be shut down soon for safety reasons. Two others are to remain in operation.

All four reactors have been described by Western experts as unsafe and nearly impossible to repair.

The BTA news agency said Thursday that the government accepted a recommendation of the International Atomic Energy Agency to shut down the plant's reactor No. 1, the one nearest the fire, on Aug. 15.

"The No. 2 reactor is to be shut down a month later, the report said.

Deputy Premier Alexander Tomov told reporters in Vienna, Austria, last week that the two reactors would be shut down this month.

It was not clear whether the two reactors would be shut for good.

Soviets not offended by leaders' responses

MOSCOW (AP) — Although Mikhail Gorbachev came away from the economic summit in London with less than some Soviets had hoped, commentators said Thursday the country should not feel disappointed or insulted.

"No one is going to give us anything simply because they are dazzled by the 'pretty eyes' of perestroika, glasnost and freedom of speech," said the Communist Party newspaper Pravda.

"When it's a matter of money or credits, self comes first, and we have no right to feel offended," it said.

At the conclusion of the summit Wednesday, the leaders of the world's strongest industrialized democracies pledged technical assistance and cooperation — but not cash or loans — to bolster Gorbachev's economic reforms.

Although the Soviet president had not asked for a specific sum of money, he made it clear he wanted international financing to prop up the ruble during a transition free trading of the currency to world markets.

Gorbachev appeared disappointed with the response from the United States, Britain, France, Italy, Canada, Germany and Japan. "We shall find our way through this, we shall extricate ourselves, whether you help us or not," he said Wednesday in London.

"At home, however, his trip was portrayed as a valuable first step. Although the immediate results were "more conceptual than pragmatic," the government newspaper Izvestia said, "they will inevitably give birth to others."

Pravda said the meeting "can be compared to the breakthrough that occurred in Geneva in 1985," when Gorbachev first met Ronald Reagan and began to chip away at the former president's conviction that the Soviet Union was an evil empire.

"That breakthrough was political, this one can become economic," the party newspaper said.

Gorbachev did get one plum in London: an announcement that President Bush would travel to Moscow at the end of the month to sign a nuclear arms control treaty at a super-power summit.

The G-7 leaders endorsed Gorbachev's economic reform program, and they offered a six-point assistance plan.

It calls for technical assistance for the Soviet energy industry, food distribution, nuclear safety and conversion of defense plants to civilian production.

It also includes "special association" status for the Soviet Union with the World Bank and International Monetary Fund. And it promises improved access for Soviet goods to Western markets.

The radical newspaper Nezavisimaya Gazeta, said that even before the London session, it was clear the G-7 countries would not provide money, so they came up with a less-tangible program.

Anglers quell blaze with creek-filled waders

TWIN FALLS — The Forest Service was battling two lightning-caused fires in the Sawtooth National Forest Thursday night, but one human-caused blaze got the best Wednesday.

Two fishermen extinguished an out-of-control campfire in the Trail Creek area east of Ketchum by using their wading boots as rubber bladders and dousing the blaze.

"The fire had spread to a nearby log," said Ed Waldapfel, public affairs director for the SNF.

They took immediate action by taking off their hip boots, filled them with water and put the fire out.

The three other fires, all ignited by a fast-moving lightning storm that riddled through the South Hills Wednesday night, required a few more resources.

The largest, the "Fortune" fire, had burned 1 1/2 acres of heavy timber in the

Raft River Division of the Burley Ranger District as of Thursday night. Firefighters completed a line around the blaze by noon Thursday and were expected to contain it before sundown.

At one time, more than 40 firefighters, aided by a helicopter, battled the blaze in steep, broken terrain, Waldapfel said.

Two smaller fires burned about one-tenth of an acre each before crews built lines around them. The "Marty" fire, located about 4 miles northeast of Strivell in the

Black Pine Division of the Burley Ranger District, was declared out at 10 p.m. Wednesday.

Firefighters expected to bring the "One Mile" fire under control Thursday night. The blaze, burning in an isolated patch of subalpine fir trees, is located near the One Mile Guard Station in the Raft River Division of the Burley Ranger District.

"There have been nine fires in the SNF so far this season. Fire danger in the forest is rated "very high," Waldapfel said.

Anyone who suspects his own bike may be among those up for sale can go to the police station and claim it before the sale, Stonemetz said. The sale begins at 10 a.m. Saturday at the police station, 356 Third Ave. E.

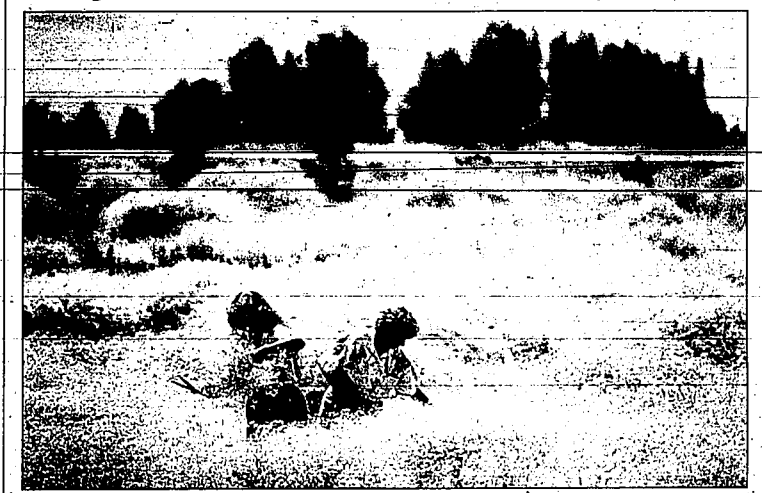

HAGERMAN — Revenue to the city from softball tournaments is worth the problems of noise, litter and other public disturbances, City Council members agree.

Last weekend, 12 teams competed in a three-day tournament that filled the city with people.

"This is business we can take to the bank," Leon Urie, president of the Hagerman Chamber of Commerce, told the council Tuesday.

There was a "tremendous amount" of glass left in the park, she said, so players and their families need to be reminded of the ban on glass in the park.

Also, Jazwick said, the city received complaints that people were urinating in

the streets. Maybe more portable rest rooms are needed, she said.

But Councilwoman Audrey Hoffman said people were not using the existing portables because they smelled "really bad."

City Clerk Coletta Lloyd agreed, saying the portable rest rooms were "really horrible."

Dave Snyder of Ag Concepts, producer of the five tournaments held every summer in Hagerman, said Thursday that these events are growing in popularity.

Except for B of A, all Idaho banks making more

TWIN FALLS — Idaho's banks, including the two home-grown Magic Valley institutions, are robustly healthy, a Texas financial service consultant says.

In separate reports, Sheshunoff Information Services Inc. said 22 of Idaho's 23 banks made money in the first three months of this year, as did all five Idaho-based thrifts including First Federal Savings & Loan of Twin Falls.

Bank of America's Idaho unit was the only financial institution to lose money. Barbara Phillips, vice president of administration for Bank of America, said the expense of buying the former Benj. Franklin Savings and Loan Association caused the loss.

Phillips said Bank of America did not purchase any of Benj. Franklin's

money-making loans when it acquired the financially strapped thrift from the government in September.

"You have a choice: we elected not to. And when you don't have earning assets you don't make interest income," she said.

Idaho's booming bank industry contrasted sharply with other states. First-quarter operating profits of the nation's 12,332 banks were down 10.1 percent from a year ago to \$5.3 billion. Eleven percent of the banks were unprofitable.

Twenty-two percent of the nation's 2,491 savings and loans did not make a profit

between Jan. 1 and March 31, according to Sheshunoff. The 536 money losers lost a total of \$2 billion in the quarter, while profitable thrifts made \$1.3 billion.

Experts said Idaho banks and thrifts did well because the state's economy is thriving.

"Even though there are two or three soft spots, the economy is strong and we reflect that," said Bernice Jensen, executive director of the Idaho Banks Association.

David Edson, chairman of First Interstate Bank of Idaho, added, "I think we've said for the last two or three years that Idaho's

School drawings make grade

HAILEY — Preliminary drawings of the proposed Blaine County middle school have been approved unanimously by the School Board.

The approval was part of a schedule that leads to a bond issue election for a middle school in September.

According to trustee Lita Sullivan, the amount of the bond issue has not been set yet. The money will pay for the proposed 90,700-square-foot middle school and renovations to four other schools in the district.

The proposed plan for the middle school, presented to the board by Boise-based Design West, would accommodate 600 students, with the capacity to handle as many as 800, according to its designer, Jim Coles.

In addition to the building that would house grades six through eight, the site also would include two softball fields, a football field, a soccer field, a track, and parking for more than 100 cars.

Superintendent Phil Homer was quick to point out that the school is needed to

accommodate the population currently in the system.

"Given no growth, we will have 700 students in the Wood River High School for the 1997-98 school year," Homer said.

The district's schools have only kept pace with current growth by adding temporary classrooms at several of the schools. Next fall, the district could be using as many as 16 temporary units, according to Homer.

The middle school plan is designed to keep each grade in a specific wing of the building with some sharing of science labs and other common facilities. The 20-acre site is located north of Hailey in the Northridge Subdivision.

In other board matters, the Hemingway Learning Institute, which has been granted the use of district land to build an after-school day-care facility, told the board that the fundraising efforts to finance the construction of the facility are not going well.

Lois Meyer, director of Hemingway Learning Institute, told the board that she has a contingency plan to use the gymnasium and cafeteria at Hemingway Elementary School until financing of the new facility has been secured.

Twin Falls residents pay taxes on time

TWIN FALLS — County residents paid the remainder of last year's property taxes, if not in good humor, at least in good faith.

"As usual, they did a good job of paying," Twin Falls County Treasurer Bonnie Bruning said Thursday.

Bruning and her staff recently finished the mid-summer rush of collecting payments from people who chose to pay their 1990 property taxes in two installments. The first payment came in December, with the remainder being due in June.

Residents owed about \$21 million in 1990 real and personal property and mobile home taxes. With the recent payments, 95 percent — or \$19.9 million — had been collected — enough to warm the heart of any county treasurer.

"In some other counties, people don't pay as well," Bruning said.

Taxes on houses and land totaled \$18.6 million in 1990. About \$943,000 of that amount remains unpaid, she said. Personal property, such as farm equipment, totaled \$2.6 million with \$100,000 of that yet to be paid. Mobile home taxes totaled \$188,000 with about \$27,000 yet to be paid, Bruning said.

In another month or so, Bruning's office will send out notices to people three years delinquent on property taxes. Usually, about 400 parcels are on the list. Most of the owners will pay at least one year's bill to keep their property.

When taxes are delinquent for more than three years, the county can take the property and sell it to pay the debt.

A few people who came in to pay the remainder of their 1990 taxes mentioned the 1 percent initiative, Bruning said.

Not surprisingly, the thought of lower property taxes seems especially appealing when you're writing out the check.

Bruning, like other government officials, said she understands people's frustration with higher property taxes. But, also like other officials, she hopes people cast informed votes.

DOE hearings end, foes outnumber backers

IDAHO FALLS — Energy Department officials on Thursday wrapped up their Idaho hearings on proposed modernization of the nation's nuclear weapons production complex, with opposition to including the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory ringing in their ears.

Support for focusing the Complex 21 proposal on INEL came from the Idaho Falls area, where the economy would benefit from the 9,000 jobs and \$15 billion in development the modernization would bring.

But as the sessions wore on it became apparent that eastern Idaho's nuclear industry was pitted against much of the rest of the state, and critics in that regional support were shouting.

Scores of people testified during the hearings, and the opponents significantly outnumbered those backing the INEL as the best of five locations being considered for consolidating up to three major weapons-production facilities.

INEL contractors, labor unions and local businessmen, who would benefit most from increased defense work in eastern Idaho, embraced the project.

Supporters also looked beyond money to the nation's need for a strong defense. They contend INEL can provide it safely, and they resent opponents who want to take that chance away from them. They also think critics have an unrealistic view of the defense markets.

"I have held a kilogram of plutonium in my hands, and I have survived," said

Police capture prison escapee

HUNTSVILLE, Texas (AP) — A Texas prison escapee has been arrested in Oregon and charged in the shooting death of a Washington state restaurant manager, police said Thursday.

Authorities say Sterling Jarnagin, 19, also has been charged in the robbery of an Idaho pawn shop. Jarnagin, who initially gave his name as Don Gooding and his age as 21, was arrested Wednesday in Ontario, Wis., with two young Yakima, Wash., men, Yakima police Capt. Don Blesio said.

The men were arrested after a Payless Drug store clerk in Oregon called police to say three men trying to buy ammunition had acted fidgety and made her suspicious. Police were able to verify Jarnagin's identity through fingerprint comparison.

Jarnagin is one of seven inmates who used a forklift truck June 28 to escape from the Coffield Unit of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, Texas authorities said.

Jarnagin has been charged with aggravated first-degree murder at the shooting death early Monday of Adam Gault, 22, a Yakima, Wash., night manager at Mr. C's Pizza in Yakima, was shot in the back after he and three other workers were forced into a walk-in freezer, Blesio said.

More than \$1,000 was taken from the restaurant safe. Jarnagin and the two other men were also charged in the Tuesday robbery of a Fruitland, Idaho pawn shop.

Johnny O. Jagobson Jr., 21, was charged in a warrant with being an accomplice to aggravated first-degree murder in the Gault case. A warrant was issued Monday for the arrest of Edgar Roy Cluff, 20, on suspicion of being an accomplice in aggravated first-degree murder. Cluff had worked for Mr. C's Pizza earlier in the year, authorities said.

Both Cluff and Jagobson are from Yakima. The three men were transferred

Wednesday night from the Milheur County jail to the Payette County Jail in Idaho. Payette County Sheriff's Department Lt. Leroy Cordes said Thursday that Jarnagin, Jagobson and Cluff were charged in the armed robbery of the Lucky Loan Pawn Shop in Fruitland. Bond was set at \$100,000 on the armed robbery charge, but bond was withheld on the murder charges, Cordes said.

Jarnagin is the last of the seven Texas inmates to be caught. Three were captured immediately. Another was captured in Fort Worth and the sixth, who was wounded, was discovered in a tractor shed at the prison.

Jarnagin had been serving 20 years for an aggravated robbery conviction in Cameron County.

The search for Jarnagin was expanded outside of Texas on July 5 after a pickup stolen near the prison in Tennessee County was found abandoned in Wichita Falls.

SALINAS, Calif. (AP) — A handcuffed man in court for an arraignment Thursday tried to take a bailiff's gun and was killed, a witness said. One officer was wounded in the scuffle.

Daniel Ray Mendoza, 37, of Salinas, had faced six felony charges related to an attempted armed robbery court record showed.

He also had finished parole in 1987 for a murder conviction 10 years earlier, according to the records. Mendoza "was kicking and jumping real high to get the gun"

from the bailiff, said Grace Mitchell, who was in the courtroom at the time. Her boyfriend, Fred Murphy, in court for extradition proceedings, was handcuffed at the wrist to Mendoza but wasn't injured.

Mitchell said she heard five shots. "I heard one officer say, 'I got hit,'" she said. The injured officer, Don Wallich,

was shot in the hip and was in stable condition at Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital, a nursing supervisor said.

It wasn't immediately clear who shot Mendoza, nor whether he shot Wallich or another officer did accidentally. The names of other officers involved weren't released. Salinas police wouldn't comment before a news conference scheduled for Friday.

Mendoza had tried to hang himself in jail Wednesday, said John Davidson, head of the county Department of Corrections.

GAO report calls for end of Hanford B Plant projects

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Energy Department should cancel \$609 million in projects designed to make Hanford's B Plant a waste treatment facility because there is no way to fix pipes that could leak radiation, a government report said Thursday.

The report by the General Accounting Office accused DOE officials of misleading the GAO about the difficulty of modifying the 46-year-old weapons plant for pretreatment of millions of gallons of nuclear waste.

It also concluded the original financial reasons for completing the B Plant projects no longer are valid.

"It is increasingly clear that B Plant is no longer a viable option for pretreating high-level waste in the double-shell (storage) tanks," the GAO said.

"The new process that DOE is developing to pretreat about 75 percent of the high-level waste requiring pretreatment is currently incompatible with B Plant's waste pipes," the report to Congress said.

"Consistent with finding a new approach is cancelling all B Plant pretreatment projects and shifting funds for these projects to developing an acceptable alternative," GAO said.

DOE planned to upgrade the World War II-era plant to pretreat high-level radioactive waste before using vitrification, a process that turns the waste to glass.

DOE spokesman Tom Bauman said from Richland, Wash., that the department had no immediate comment.

A spokesman for Rep. Sid Morrison, R-Wash., said the B Plant's problems should have no effect on a cleanup agreement that calls for vitrification plant construction to begin next April and be in operation by 1999.

"This issue should not be used to delay the construction of the vitrification plant. That's really the issue here for a lot of people at home," press secretary Rick Olson said.

The department has acknowledged the B Plant's difficulty in meeting federal environmental laws and has placed on hold more than \$400 million worth of B Plant modification projects.

However, the DOE has in progress five plant-related projects totaling \$43 million, including the \$25.1 million TRUEX pilot plant project. A total of \$609 million in modifications are planned through 1999.

"Despite serious concerns about using B Plant as the pretreatment facility, DOE continues to modify the plant for that purpose," the GAO report said.

DOE already has spent \$23 million on completed capital modifications to the plant.

The GAO report was requested last fall by Rep. Don Young, D-Okla., chairman of the House Government Operations subcommittee on environment, energy and natural resources.

Synar said Thursday he has asked Energy Secretary James Watkins to cut off all funding for B Plant upgrades and to give his subcommittee a full accounting of the project.

"DOE misled the GAO and misled the Congress about the cost and complexity of upgrading the B Plant at Hanford," Synar said.

"There is also evidence that DOE has been trying to hide the full cost of this project by breaking it up into dozens of smaller construction projects," he said.

The GAO said the B Plant does not meet existing environmental regulations and that the state of Washington is unlikely to grant any waivers.

It said that as early as 1987, DOE had information available showing that some of B Plant's single-walled pipes had failed.

An April 1989 study reported that the plant's pipes did not comply with DOE design criteria and concluded that the pipes "would be almost impossible to replace."

DOE officials later told the GAO that an upgrade of \$14 million could bring B Plant into compliance with current standards. But in January, the director of DOE's Office of Environmental Restoration and Waste Management told the GAO the earlier assumption was in error.

The GAO said officials for the DOE claimed they could demonstrate that concrete in which B Plant's pipes are embedded would provide adequate double containment of high-level radioactive waste.

But the plant's Westinghouse operations manager said contamination earlier migrated through concrete containment barriers in B Plant. In the 1980s, chemicals leaked from tank valves in the plant's Aqueous Makeup Unit and migrated through two feet of concrete to administrative offices below.

A further problem is the lack of adequate leak detection systems, the report said: In July 1990, Westinghouse discovered a leak of radioactive liquid that went undetected for a year in the plant's electrical distribution facility.

Westinghouse estimates between 85,000 and 230,000 gallons of the liquid leaked within B Plant and into the soil under B Plant, the GAO said.

DOE continued the modification work for treatment because it considered modification less costly than construction of a new facility, the report said.

The bank netted \$45.9 million in loans, down 6.7 percent over the previous three months, but had \$555,000 in non-performing loans, a 21.8 percent decrease from December 1990, and 76 percent of total assets.

Idaho-based savings and loans earned \$1.8 million in the first quarter. That was 167.5 percent more than last year, the fourth fastest rate in the country.

First Federal earned \$206,000 from January through March on assets of \$200.1 million.

The thrift listed \$65.8 million in loans, up 2.9 percent in December, 1990, and had \$470,000 in non-performing loans, a 17.8 percent increase in three months but just 7 percent of total assets.

Total assets of Idaho's banks grew 4.1 percent to \$8.9 billion, the fourth-fastest rate in the nation. Loans grew 1.1 percent to \$5.8 billion, the eighth-fastest rate.

"The value of bad loans declined 0.2 percent from end of 1990, teaching \$50.2 million. Bad loans were 0.86 percent of gross loans, making Idaho's ranking the second best in the United States."

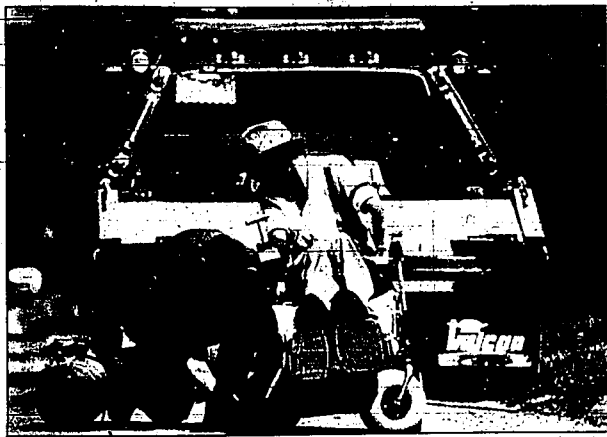

Ex-sheriff tells his side of shooting

CALDWELL (AP) — Dale Haile spent most of the past 50 years carrying a badge and a gun, but he never shot and killed anyone until after his retirement last winter.

That irony isn't lost on the 76-year-old Haile, former longtime Canyon County sheriff and coroner. On Wednesday, he spoke publicly for the first time about what happened when he shot James Myron Spears to death June 18.

"I wish it hadn't happened," Haile said. "It didn't add to my prestige or dignity. And it doesn't make you feel good to have killed somebody. It's no great tribute, that's for sure."

Since the shooting, Haile has been forced to wait for a state investigation to clear his name. That finally happened Wednesday in findings released by the attorney general's office.

Spears was having an on-again, off-again relationship.

The Donndelingers recently filed for divorce from her husband, a Nampa pathologist and former Canyon County coroner.

Haile said he did his best to protect Mrs. Donndelinger from Spears. Before the shooting, Haile claimed Spears threatened his life twice, including one time with a shotgun aimed at his stomach.

The day of the shooting, Haile said both he and Mrs. Donndelinger were threatened by Spears over the telephone. Despite a protective order barring Spears from making contact, Mrs. Donndelinger took the latest threat seriously. She asked Haile to escort her home and stay the night, Haile said.

At her urging, Haile said he

grabbed the loaded 9mm pistol he kept under a living-room chair. He slid the gun under his belt. A bullet was in the barrel. "I don't carry an empty gun around," Haile said. "It's not worth much."

When they arrived at the Donndelinger home about 10:30 p.m., Haile said he was standing on the porch by the front door. He noticed the parking lights were on in Mrs. Donndelinger's pickup.

As he walked over to the car, Haile said he was jumped from behind in the darkness. He was knocked hard to the ground, skinned his arm and knee.

As the pair wrestled on the ground, with the younger man on top, Haile said he managed to withdraw his black-steeel gun and fire a single shot into Spears' chest.

FBI informant reveals his dislike of environmentalists in trial testimony

PRESCOTT, Ariz. (AP) — Jurors hearing conspiracy charges watched a video recording Thursday of an FBI informant during which he showed a strong dislike for environmentalists while under hypnosis.

"I don't have too awful good a view of ecologists," Ron Frazier told FBI agents while hypnotized by Richard Garver of San Antonio, Texas.

FBI agents flew with Frazier to San Antonio March 9, 1988, for the hypnosis session in an effort to seek the last name of an alleged saboteur.

Five environmental activists, including the co-founder of the militant organization Earth First!, David Foreman of Tucson, are charged with conspiring to damage nuclear facilities in Arizona, California and Colorado.

The other defendants, all from Prescott, are charged with damaging a ski lift, power poles to a uranium mine and power lines to an aqueduct.

During the video, Frazier said urban ecologists promote the wilderness in order to further their careers and have no desire to actually live in the wild.

"It's a fishbowl thing. They don't want to live out there ... They just want it there as a place to get wild," he said.

"They're not interested in getting dirty, hungry and cold. Things I grew up with."

Frazier said only four to six of the environmentalists at a Prescott rally in 1987 were actually members of Earth First! and the others belonged to other Prescott ecological groups.

Frazier also expressed suspicion of Earth First! and the group's power structure, saying the organization wanted to "save the earth" but that "I don't think once you set up a power structure like that you're going to quit."

He also said that while working

part-time for a Prescott upholstery shop, he "blew up" at the owner, a friend of defendant Mark Davis, at that afterwards the local group "treated him gently."

"They were concerned I may turn them in for vindictive reasons," he said.

Frazier also told of becoming the lover of defendant Ilse Asplund, saying her husband had drawn away from her while pursuing a doctoral degree.

Davis, whom Asplund was planning to live with at the time, Frazier said, is persistent in pursuit of actions based on his beliefs.

"Once he gets turned on, nobody can shut him off," Frazier said.

It was not for vindictive reasons but rather out of concern for defendant Asplund and her two children and in order to halt environmental sabotage that he became an FBI informant, he said.

"If we can fry some bigger fish, my personal friends, won't get hurt too bad," he said.

Frazier said he was willing to do what was required of him as an informant and was able to deceive the environmentalists regarding his true feelings about them.

"I can play the game now," Frazier said.

U.S. District Judge Robert Broomfield ruled the tape could be admitted only in regard to Davis and not to the other defendants.

The volume of the tape was turned off to delete portions referred to by their attorneys.

During questioning by Jack, Frazier confirmed he was advised before the session that hypnosis could increase both his correct and incorrect recollection.

Man burned in thermal pool

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, Wyo. (AP) — A Missouri man was in serious condition in a Utah hospital Thursday after being burned in a fall into two Yellowstone National Park thermal pools.

Park Superintendent Bob Barbee said Joseph Widelock, 18, of Fordland, Mo., suffered first-, second- and third-degree burns over 67 percent of his body after falling into the pools early Thursday morning.

According to park officials, Widelock, an employee of Hamilton Stores at Old Faithful Geyser, was walking and running near a group of thermal pools when he fell into one hot spring, scrambled out and fell into a second pool.

The temperature of the water in the pools is about 147 degrees.

Officials said Widelock and a companion walked about 250 feet from the road where they obtained help.

Widelock initially was treated at Lake Hospital and then taken by ambulance to West Yellowstone, Mont. He later was flown to the University Hospital's Intermountain Burn Unit in Salt Lake City.

Indians file complaint against tribal leader

LAPWAL (AP) — Nez Perce Indian fishermen angered by the fast-track cancellation of a salmon fishing season at Rapid River have filed a complaint against the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee. — Nez Perce leaders are accused in tribal court of malfeasance for backing away from a weekend season for spring chinook salmon July 6-7. — The complaint was filed by Jesse Greene of Lapwai, a former tribal council member and chairman of the Lapwai-based Senior Citizens Pro-

gram. It was endorsed by the Nez Perce Fishermen's Committee. — "It is my firm belief that NPTCC members have placed themselves above the people who they've sworn daily to protect," Greene said. Failing to allow the tribe's fishermen a season promise, "a cultural genocide on the people who exercise their rights under treaties." — Tribal leaders canceled the spring chinook season when fewer fish than expected returned to the Rapid River Fish Hatchery. The action

came on the eve of the season approval two days earlier and only hours after the Idaho Fish and Game Commission voted to ban tribal fishing for spring chinook. — Charles "Pete" Hayes, chairman of the Tribal Executive Committee, said Wednesday that he had not seen the charges. He called the complaint a sign of frustration by tribal members over their inability to harvest salmon from waters traditionally fished by the Nez Perce. — But Greene said fishermen also are angry because the Tribal Executive Council first approved, then backed away from a season. — "It would have been a lot simpler if they would have said from the start that there wouldn't be any fishing," he said. — Hayes said earlier that tribal leaders set the season in hopes that 1,750 spring chinook would enter the Rapid River hatchery by the time the scheduled season arrived. But only about 1,550 fish entered the hatchery.

Judge sets hearing on bond in murder case

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — Sixth District Judge Grant Young has scheduled a hearing for July 25 to determine whether bond should be set for a first-degree murder suspect. — Rauland Grube, 27, of Ashton has been held in the Fremont County Jail since his arrest for the 1983 slaying of an Ashton teen-ager. — Defense Attorney Greg Mochler maintained the evidence against Grube is not sufficiently strong to deny him bond. — Grube was arrested May 15 for the murder of Amy Elizabeth Hossner, 15, as she slept in bed in the family's Ashton home. Hossner died of a single shotgun blast to the neck and chest. — Young has "yet to" rule on Mochler's request that a 12-gauge Winchester shotgun owned by Grube be made available for further testing. — The gun has been held as evidence since July 1983.

Some disagree with contribution plan

POCATELLO — The state's gearing up to give Idaho taxpayers another way to donate money when filling out personal income tax forms. — But not everyone agrees that tax forms are the best way to solicit charitable contributions. — "Personally, my feeling is the state Tax Commission is responsible for collecting taxes, not contributions," said Larry Jeffries, past president of the Idaho Society of CPAs. — State tax forms have checkoffs where people can donate to various causes. This year, a sixth category was added. The Alzheimer's disease fund joins donations for nongame wildlife endangered species, drug enforcement, children's trust, agriculture in the classroom and U.S. Olympics.

Lewiston may collect taxes on vehicles

LEWISTON — The Lewiston City Council is considering an annual \$15 tax on local vehicles, but it would be called a user fee. — Revenue from the proposed fee, projected at \$450,000 a year, would be included in next year's budget, which takes effect Oct. 1. — But Mayor Delitta Kilgore said Wednesday that the fee will not be imposed until the council has discussed it in the fall. It is likely to be effective Jan. 1 if the council approves it. — "What it would do is provide extra dollars for street maintenance and for the Bryden Canyon Road project," Kilgore said. "If Bryden Canyon Road does not come about, then it will be channeled to street maintenance."

County commission to reduce golf tax

COEUR D'ALENE — The state Tax Commission has approved the Kootenai County Commission's request to reconsider its decision to reduce the assessed value of The Coeur d'Alene Resort Golf Course by \$3.6 million. — The request was submitted Monday after Commissioner Bob Haakenson acknowledged there was at least the appearance of a conflict of interest in his vote to reduce the valuation. — Two of Haakenson's children work for Hagadone Hospitality Co., which owns the lakefront golf course that includes a green floating on a barge in Lake Coeur d'Alene. — County commissioners will reconvene Monday as the Kootenai County Board of Equalization to reconsider the July 8 decision to reduce the property tax valuation recommended by Assessor Tom Moore. — Moore valued the property at \$1212 million, but commissioners Haakenson and Bob Macdonald voted to assess it at \$8.48 million.

Congressman pays \$700 campaign violation fine

BOISE (AP) — Rep. Larry LaRocco, D-Idaho, has paid a \$700 fine for violating the Federal Election Campaign Act during the 1990 primary. — LaRocco admitted failing to report a personally guaranteed \$20,000 loan to his campaign within the required 48 hours. The Federal Election Commission accepted a settlement with the LaRocco for Congress Committee on June 19. — "It was a mistake, but it certainly wasn't intentional," LaRocco said Wednesday.

"It's simply a technical violation. We negotiated the fine, we got it behind us." — LaRocco said his campaign misunderstood the law, and his staff's reading of FEC's campaign rules led them to believe they were in compliance. — Jeanne Givens, who finished second to LaRocco in the May 1990 Democratic primary for Idaho's 1st Congressional District seat, called the situation "unfortunate."

Givens recalled Wednesday how LaRocco blasted her for exaggerating her support by including a \$9,000 loan in her reported fund-raising. — "It's an interesting irony." — Givens said. "He took after me because I had misrepresented the amount of money I raised." — The law requires that candidates report large "last-minute" contributions within 48 hours — those over \$1,000 made in the final 20 days of a campaign. It also classifies loans guaranteed by the candidate, or others, as contributions. — LaRocco said his campaign believed loans were exempt from the 48-hour provision. The \$20,000 loan was disclosed in his July 1990 report.

Nez Perce national trail to be dedicated

GROFINO (AP) — Two direct descendants of Chief Joseph will be on hand Friday when the Nez Perce National Historic Trail is formally dedicated at Lolo Pass on the Idaho-Montana border. — Joe and Soy Redthunder will be among members of Nez Perce Tribe joined by state and federal officials for ceremonies marked by tribal activities. The trail, given national recognition by Congress five years ago, marks the tribe's 1877 flight under the leadership of Chief Joseph from thousands of federal troops, civilian volunteers and Indians from treaty tribes.

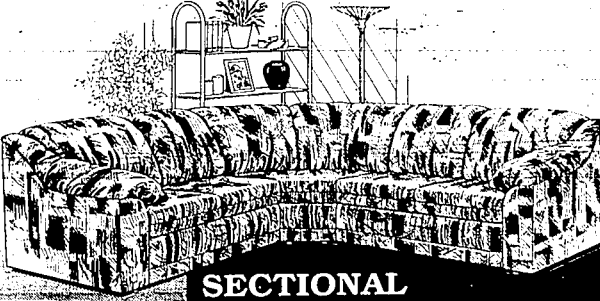

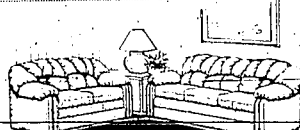

But maybe that sense of money as an illusory but beautiful commodity is part of the fantasy that appeals to moviegoers. It's the same credit-card mentality attitude, cultivated during the last decade, that accounts in part for America's unprecedented federal budget deficit and huge outstanding consumer debt. And you wonder why we're in a recession ...

Last year's biggest movies - "Home Alone," "Ghost," "Pretty Woman" - were all fairy tales fueled by endless cash.

Despite an enormous family, "Home Alone" breadwinners John Heard and Catherine O'Hara never have to worry about feeding all those mouths or keeping the roof of a suburban Chicago mansion over their little heads. We just take it for granted that they're made of money.

'Naked Gun,' offers too much off-the-wall humor

The following are movie reviews now showing in the Magic Valley. Ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America and the Los Angeles Times. Opinions are by Los Angeles Times reviewers.

THE NAKED GUN (PG-13). The title is funny, so are the credits and the key art—everything in fact except the film itself. After unrepentant cracks at this kind of humor, director-writer David Zucker has finally beaten a dead horse into the ground with yet another incarnation of fearless Lt. "Frank" Drebin (Leslie Nielsen). If a hunger for this kind of off-the-wall humor strikes, do yourself a favor and rent the original "Airplane!"

CITY SLICKERS (PG-13). The old cliche of setting a bunch of civilized nincompoops loose in the wide-open spaces is not a fresh one, but it's still funny. There are enough laughs in "City Slickers" to get you through the willy-washing macho-brother stuff. Billy Crystal, Bruno Kirby and Daniel Stern are the three buddies who take a two-week vacation as cattle herders. As the leathery, craft-gingered, Jack Palance steals the movie.

101 DALMATIANS (G). That lovable gaggle of animated dogs

returns in a ruse of the Disney classic in which villainous Cruella De Ville steals a heap of Dalmatian puppies for the wonderful coats they make. Betty Lou Gerson provides De Vil's malevolent voice.

ROBIN HOOD (PG-13). A case where more is less, this newest version of the venerable tale of outlaws in Sherwood Forest can't decide if it's a traditional action adventure, a New Age fable or a Monty Python farce. Making things even more muddled, star Kevin Costner doesn't have the moxie to play an outlaw king. The action is fine, but at two hours and 23 minutes, everything else begged to be cut.

THE ROCKETEER (PG-13). This glitzy hamper for the '90s is made for a decade of diminished expectations. While films like "Raiders of the Lost Ark" wanted to kid the genre and serve up the action, this tale of fearless flyboy Cliff Secord, a youth with a dream who turns himself into a man who can fly and fight evil at the same time, plays things straighter than one would have thought possible. The most expensive and faithful recreation of a Saturday afternoon serial, perfect for the 10-year-old-boy in your life.

'Point Break' mostly just treads water

"Point Break" has its areas of excitement, but on too many occasions the movie just lets the camera watch when it does, however, the film still manages to look and sound good. The film was directed by Kathryn Bigelow, whose last film, "Blue Steel," was a silly mixture of reason and outrage. "Point Break" is better than that, though there are a few times when you may wonder who wrote the script. There are also times when you may ask where the FBI agents in the film were trained.

The film stars Keanu Reeves and Patrick Swayze. Reeves is a young FBI agent who poses as a surfer to become part of a gang of surfers who may be doubling as bank robbers. When the gang is making money — with the use of guns — they wear masks of residents Nixon, Carter, Johnson and Reagan. The police and the press to refer to them as "The Presidents." The robberies are fast, and so is much of the film. As fast chase between the FBI man and lead hold-up man is one of the most exciting (and novel) ever done on the screen, and elsewhere, the movie contains magnificent surfing and sky-diving footage. The score is also a plus. When the film seems to be going nowhere and the plot begins to thin, the sound and the photography almost make us forget that the action had come to a virtual halt. Swayze enjoys bad-guy role in latest movie

Hunky heartthrob Patrick Swayze has been in two of the biggest movies of the past five years — the Catskills romance "Dirty Dancing" and last summer's supernatural sleeper, "Ghost." The latter became 1990's runaway hit, grossing about \$400 million worldwide.

But between 1987's "Dirty Dancing," in which he teamed with Jennifer Grey, and "Ghost," opposite Demi Moore, Swayze was in a couple of flops, "Steel Dawn" (1987) with his wife, Lisa Niemi, and the 1989 action movie "Road House" and "New Kid."

In "Dirty Dancing" and "Ghost," Swayze played vulnerable but resilient underdogs.

In his less successful movies, he has played macho types.

No one denies that Swayze puts his heart, soul and body into his movies, successful or not. In his latest, "Point Break," an action adventure movie set in the Southern California world of surfing, sky diving and bank robberies, he plays a macho bad guy named Bodhi.

"If I didn't have the success of getting away with jumping into a character like this because I wanted to not have to carry the film in order to get the license to do more of a character, and do this guy who's a little wild, a little strange, a little sane, a little right, a little wrong," he said.

"Nine times out of 10, the bad guy's the best role, because they've got problems and subtlety and things to play. A white hat — you need to

dirty up that white hat sometimes."

For "Point Break," former professional dancer Swayze did much of his own surfing and sky diving, even though he said he had not tried either before making the movie.

"The funny thing was, it was a joke for the insurance company to give me such a hassle about the sky diving when, statistically, sky diving has become one of the safest sports around."

"Once I got over the abrupt terror of jumping out of a perfectly good airplane and realized that you could truly fly, it was the most alive feeling that I've ever felt. Once I got into seeing it as a ballet or as a tumbling routine, fear went out. Sky diving really changed my life. And so did surfing. I'll be a surfer till I die."

"They (the insurance company) didn't say one word about this surfing. I almost died repeatedly. ... I got

slammed into coral reefs. I got held down. ... But I had two of the best duties in the world. I just got good enough when they could cut from me to these doubles (Matt Archbold, considered one of the best hot dog surfers, and Derrick Doerner, a top big wave surfer) and you'd never be able to tell."

Swayze, 37, a Houston native, who moved to New York City to study with the Harkness Ballet Company and the Joffrey before joining the Eliot Feld Ballet as a principal dancer, identifies with Bodhi's physical approach to life.

"If you go too far with that adrenaline junkie mentality, you're walking a tightrope. You die, and so do other people. I've lived from that point of view all my life, but I've also been really clear of the danger of walking that edge."

Markie Post loves being Christine as 'Night Court' enters 8th season

Picture Wile E. Coyote standing on the edge of a cliff. As long as he remains blissfully unaware of the precariousness of his position, everything's fine. But as soon as he notices that something's wrong, look out!

That's when he begins his long drop to the canyon floor and the inevitable cloud-of-dust impact.

Markie Post can identify with that.

Post stars as big-hearted but naive public defender Christine Sullivan on "Night Court," NBC's popular situation comedy that begins its eighth full-season this fall. The show — which also stars Harry Anderson as Judge Harry Stone, John Larroquette as assistant district attorney Dan Fielding, Charles Robinson as court clerk Mac Robinson, Richard Moll as bailiff Bull Shannon and Marsha Warfield as court matron Roz Russell — is airing Wednesday nights throughout the summer.

The role of Christine Sullivan is one that Post has come to love, but it is also one that came about as the result of a career path that was something less than systematic. After graduating from college as an acting major in the early '70s, she moved to Hollywood, where she took a job as a question writer and researcher on the game show "Split Second."

"I call the time I spent working on game shows 'my cocktail-waitress period,'" Post remembers. "Everybody who's an actor has a period like that, where you're a waitress or something to make ends

meet. After I finished college, I went to be a contestant on 'Split Second,' because I knew a lot of trivia. But they offered me a job, and I took it. Later, I wrote questions for 'Family Feud,' and I shopped for prizes for 'The Price Is Right.' After about three years of that, I was an associate producer on a game show called 'Double Dare.'"

All the while, Post worked in small theater productions in the Los Angeles area. When she got the word that "Double Dare" had been canceled, she figured it was time to make a decision about whether to pursue acting seriously or stay in game shows.

"I left with nothing," she says.

It was lunacy, really. I had nothing definite on the horizon. But I guess that I knew I had to be really desperate before I would go out and find something. I was happy doing game

shows, but it wasn't what I had come to Hollywood to do. So I got an agent, and about a month later, I did a pilot for Dick Clark Productions. I really haven't been out of work since then.

"It doesn't normally happen that way!" Post marvels. "I think of myself as Wile E. Coyote: As long as he doesn't look down, he's OK. I would go to read for a part, and I had no fear. I think that lack of fear made people think that I really knew what I was doing. They'd hire me, and I'd be thinking, 'Wow, this is great.' Then I began to realize that there are thousands of people who want to do what I am doing."

The Bell gimmick is worth stealing. Never let viewers know your characters inside out. Keep the folks in the dark.

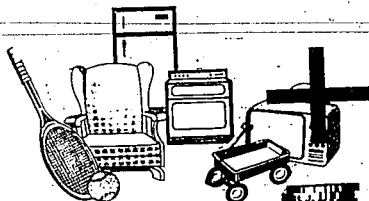

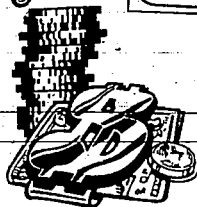

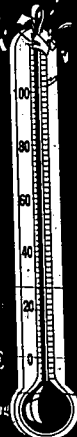
