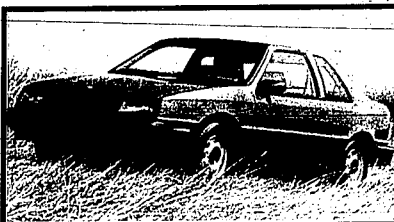

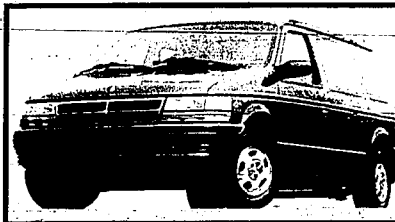

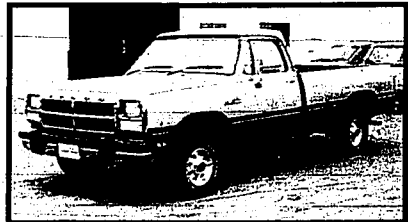

U.S. says Iraq hides nuclear arms

WASHINGTON — The White House on Thursday accused Iraq of playing a "shell game" to defy a U.N. deadline to provide a full inventory of its weapons of mass destruction.

But officials indicated military action was not imminent.

"July 25, today, was not a deadline for military action," deputy White House press secretary Roman Popadiuk said. He would not rule it out down the road, however.

President Bush said the discovery that Iraq was producing weapons-grade

uranium underscored that "we did the right thing" in moving against Saddam Hussein in the Persian Gulf War.

"Who can doubt this now -- knowing as we do just how close Saddam Hussein was to possessing nuclear weapons and the means to deliver them against defenseless men, women and children," Bush said.

The president, speaking to the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Church's annual convention, called Saddam "a man of brutal means and unmitigated evil." He did not mention the deadline.

U.S. officials said they had no reason to expect compliance, even at the last minute.

"This is unfortunate because we've made it quite clear. He will abide by the U.N. resolutions," Popadiuk declared.

"In terms of nuclear weapons, I think it's been quite obvious over the past two or three weeks that they've been playing a shell game with their equipment," he added.

The United Nations directed Iraq to deliver a full account of its nuclear program and unconventional weapons capability by Thursday.

Leaders of the United States, Britain and France had warned that the allies might renew air attacks if Iraq did not comply

with the U.N. demands. In Baghdad, the spectre of new bombings sent thousands of Iraqis fleeing the city Thursday.

But U.S. officials as well as U.N. Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar played down the possibility of impending U.S. military strikes against Iraq's nuclear program.

"I am not particularly concerned because I don't think that the government of the United States is preparing now to attack again the Iraqi territory together with its allies," Perez de Cuellar said at the U.N. headquarters in New York.

Jerome adults, students protest split sessions for middle school

JEROME — Chants, marchers stomping up and down Lincoln Avenue and signs on sticks stating "No split sessions" heralded a protest rally held in Jerome Thursday morning to express dissatisfaction with split sessions slated for middle school students.

"I don't like to do this, but sometimes it's the only way to get your point across," K. Bailey, spokesman for the protesters, said.

About 45 people showed up to participate in the protest rally. There were no school officials present to watch the proceedings.

A group of parents attended the School Board meeting Monday to tell board members they did not approve of the decision to have split sessions for sixth-through-eighth-grade students.

The parents suggested several alternatives to split sessions, including keeping everything as is, buying modular buildings, putting the Jerome Early Education Program students in the National Guard armory, using the Central School cafeteria for classrooms and moving business offices out of school buildings.

"I was really disappointed that after the board meeting they didn't even take a vote," said Bailey, a teacher of 11 years.

"We're going to see a building

inspector to see if modular buildings could be put behind Central Elementary School, and we have a group ready to move everything back to Central, if the School Board decides to cancel split sessions and put everything back the way it was," Ann Egbert, a parent, said.

Under split sessions, half the middle school students will attend class during the first part of the day, and the other half will attend school during the afternoon and early evening.

Seven junior high cheerleaders were at the Thursday morning rally, but had been told by their advisor they couldn't cheer, according to Jani Meyers, one of the cheerleaders.

Pentagon says MIA photo came from dubious source

WASHINGTON — A photograph allegedly showing three Americans held captive in Southeast Asia has been linked to known fakes of that kind of information in Cambodia, the Pentagon said Thursday.

Much of the information accompanying the photo is untrue, the Pentagon said. But defense analysts still have not concluded that the photo is a fake.

Biographical details on the three men, including things as fundamental as birth dates, Social Security numbers and home addresses, were wrong. A letter allegedly written by one contained such errors of grammar and spelling that the Pentagon has determined it was not written by anyone who spoke English as a native language.

Marine Lt. Col. Kerry Gershanack, a spokesman for the Pentagon, said that even though much of the information is suspect,

the authenticity of the photograph will depend on a separate analysis.

"We don't know if the photo is real or not," he said.

Families have identified the three men as Air Force Maj. Albro Lundy Jr., Navy Lt. Cmdr. Larry Stevens, and Air Force Col. John Leighton Robertson. The three men were lost in separate incidents in the late 1960s while flying missions during the Vietnam War. All have been declared killed in action, but no bodies have been recovered.

In the years that passed since the men were shot down, there had been no information that any of them was alive before 1990, the report said.

The report issued Thursday might be the Defense Department is a summary of the analyses done on the information the government has received on the men as well as on the mysterious photograph.

AP Poll: Public wanted Saddam forced out

NEW YORK (AP) — Seventy percent of Americans in an Associated Press poll said the United States should have continued fighting the Persian Gulf War to force Saddam Hussein from power.

As the Iraqi president clings to power five months after the war, the poll taken July 17-21 found only 22 percent agreeing with the decision to cease fighting without overthrowing Saddam.

A comparable AP poll the second week of the war found Americans favored Saddam's ouster by a 59-38 percent margin, though it was never the expressed goal of Operation Desert Storm.

In the latest poll, six in 10 called the U.S. military effort completely or mostly successful. President Bush's decision to go to war when he did held a 73 percent approval level, statistically tied from the 74 percent found by the AP poll Jan. 23-27.

Those disapproving dropped from 24 percent to 19 percent because of a higher "don't know" response, particularly among women.

The allies hoped Iraq's military humiliation and diplomatic and economic isolation would be enough to topple Saddam after the war. Bush had encouraged uprisings by Shiite Muslim and Kurdish rebels, allied bombings had devastated Iraq's economy and sanctions had cut off Saddam's oil revenue.

But the Iraqi president has since suppressed the uprisings and consolidated his power. On July 8, his government acknowledged it was engaged in a preliminary program to build nuclear bombs, but it has balked at full U.S. inspection of its nuclear capabilities, leading the United States to threaten new military action.

U.S. lent \$844 million to 324 healthy co-ops

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government granted \$844 million in low-interest, taxpayer-financed loans over the last 32 years to 324 rural electric co-ops that were healthy enough to obtain commercial credit instead, auditors say.

The Agriculture Department's inspector general's office recommended that co-ops be held to a standard of need for future loans from the Rural Electrification Administration, according to a report obtained by The Associated Press.

The auditors found that nearly 70 percent of the REA's 470 borrowers qualified for commercial loans, and they accounted for half of the \$1.75 billion in 35-year, 5-percent loans issued by the agency in that period.

The REA, which differs with the inspector general's proposed criteria for determining a co-op's financial health, agreed that the stronger utilities should be denied government "credit" and is drafting such a rule. But it defended its past lending practices as a matter of congressional mandate.

The report generally reflects a lack of understanding of the manner in which the Congress has directed the REA to operate. REA Administrator Gary C. Byrne told Assistant Inspector General James Ebbitt in response to the internal March report.

Congress has protected rural co-ops, since the New Deal era, and may well step in to block the rules change now being drafted. The program already is under fire from the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, the industry's powerful lobbying association.

The REA, an arm of the Agriculture Department, was created by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1935 to provide electricity to rural areas deemed unprofitable by larger power companies. It now directs billions of dollars in loans and loan guarantees to co-ops that provide power to 25 million people in 46 states.

Since the 1970s, REA subsidies

Senate panel votes to extend benefits

WASHINGTON — The Senate Finance Committee voted Thursday to give the long-term unemployed up to five more months of jobless benefits — a proposal the Bush administration opposes unless it is accompanied by spending cuts to pay the \$5.8 billion cost.

Democratic leaders are pushing for full Senate action next week, before Congress adjourns for its month-long August recess.

House Democrats, meanwhile, put together a version of the plan that would give President Bush the option of declaring an emergency to pay for it, as the Senate bill does, or raising employer taxes to make up the difference.

The House Ways and Means Committee is expected to vote on that version next week. The measure, which would extend benefits to the long-term unemployed for up to 20 additional weeks beyond the current 26-week standard, passed the Senate committee on a 16-4 vote.

All of the panel's Democrats were in favor, as were five Republicans.

Committee heads toward showdown

WASHINGTON — A House Judiciary subcommittee moved toward a constitutional showdown with the Bush administration Thursday by subpoenaing a secret document authorizing the FBI to kidnap fugitives in foreign countries.

The panel's demand for the 1989 opinion by the Justice Department's Office of Legal Counsel comes as the department faces court challenges to its authority to prosecute defendants who were grabbed in foreign countries and spirited to the United States to stand trial.

The department warned that disclosing the opinion could jeopardize the prosecution of deposed Panamanian dictator Manuel Noriega and other accused drug traffickers brought to this country.

Judge: Georgia furlough plan illegal

ATLANTA — Georgia's plan of furloughing state employees one day a month to help spending is illegal because Gov. Zell Miller instituted it on his own, a judge ruled Thursday.

Miller said he won't appeal, but warned that the ruling means either more layoffs of state employees next month or a reinstatement of the furlough program by the Legislature.

Superior Court Judge Philip Etheridge said the governor lacked authority to institute furloughs without legislative approval.

Army releases identity of 3 soldiers

WASHINGTON — The Army on Thursday identified the three American soldiers killed earlier this week in an explosion of ammunition near a military camp at Doha, Kuwait.

The three were identified as Staff Sgt. Ricky L. Bunch, 29, an ordnance disposal specialist from Corbin Whitley, Ky.; Pfc. Joshua J. Fleming, 19, from Kent, Wash., of the 58th Combat Engineer Co. of the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment in Germany, and Sgt. 1st Class Donald T. Murphy, Jr., 34, an ordnance disposal specialist.

The Army said it had no record of Murphy's home town.

City worker stayed in hole 18 hours

ORLANDO, Fla. — A city worker who fell into a drain hole while on a plant-watering detail says she spent 18 hours in the 10-foot-deep trap before co-workers noticed she was missing.

Barbara Cornwall stopped her state tank truck near a highway Tuesday, jumped off and landed on a loose drain cover.

"The grate went down with me," she said, adding that she suffered some cuts and bruises in the fall. While she was trapped, she said, the truck motor continued to run, the hazard lights blinked and the door stayed open, but no one stopped to investigate.

Woman sentenced for shackling child

CROWN POINT, Ind. — A woman was sentenced Thursday to two years in prison for keeping her 6-year-old son tied to his bed with a homemade leash to prevent him from getting out of bed at night.

Lottie E. DeMontigny cried when Lake Superior Court Judge James Letsinger announced the sentence. Sentencing for her former husband, John W. Wolfe, was continued to Friday.

DeMontigny and Wolfe, 29, were arrested on charges of child neglect in Hammond on Mother's Day after a neighbor heard the child's plea for food and found him shackled.

Governor used jet for vacation

RICHMOND, Va., (AP) — Gov. L. Douglas Wilder, criticized last year for using state aircraft for personal trips, flew in the state jet to New York City for his vacation last week, state records show.

He says he'll pay for the flight. Department of Aviation flight logs show the jet took Wilder to John F. Kennedy International Airport on July 13 and returned to New York to bring him back to Rich-

mond on July 21. The state's twin-engine, eight-passenger Cessna Citation II costs \$625 an hour to operate, so the two round-trips, plus landing fees at Kennedy, cost nearly \$2,700, about 15 times the \$173 cost of a round-trip commercial ticket. Wilder declined Thursday to say where he spent the week. He said he reimbursed the state for other personal trips and will pay the cost of the New York flight.

Gorbachev urges putting away past

MOSCOW (AP) — President Mikhail S. Gorbachev urged Communist leaders Thursday to save their disintegrating party by rejecting "outdated ideological dogmas" and seeking support beyond the working class.

The latest and most direct bid by Gorbachev to move his party away from Marxist-Leninist politics came at the opening of a two-day Central Committee meeting that was expected to pit hard-liners against reformers.



Gorbachev urged Communist leaders Thursday to save their disintegrating party by rejecting "outdated ideological dogmas" and seeking support beyond the working class.

But the beginning of the closed-door conference appeared less divisive than anticipated, even though Gorbachev's proposed platform endorsed ideas once vilified by Communists: a free-market economy, ownership of private property and freedom of religion.

The lack of strident opposition at the plenum indicated that even hard-liners recognize the need to recast the party's image and try to recapture public support.

Gorbachev, who is party chief as well as national president, also said the goal of a communist empire was unrealistic.

He attacked orthodox hard-liners for being inflexible to changes needed to save the party that has ruled the Soviet Union for 73 years.

Hard-liners at the opening session in the Kremlin Palace offered only the mild, general criticism that Gorbachev's proposed platform was vague.

Unlike the first Central Committee plenum in April, there

were no calls for his resignation as general secretary of the party, according to participants interviewed afterward.

Gorbachev told the 42-million people about one-fifth of the Communist Party membership — had quit in the last two years, the independent Interfax news agency reported. The party now claims to have 16.3 million members.

Party traditionalists "reject the diversity of forms of ownership, do not recognize the need to reform political structures of society, and subject the state's foreign policy to tendentious criticism," the mass news agency quoted Gorbachev as saying.

Gorbachev also criticized Russian Parliament President Boris Yeltsin's decree that ordered the dismantling of Communist Party cells in factories, schools, government offices and other workplaces across the huge republic by Aug. 6.

Yeltsin's decree, which struck at the heart of the party's power, was roundly attacked at the session. The 440-member Central Committee is expected to vote Friday on a resolution condemning the decree.

Floods threaten economic recovery promise

BEIJING (AP) — Before the rains began, 1991 was projected as a year of recovery for China's sluggish economy, and local officials had hope of matching last year's record harvest.

But all that is in doubt now, after two months of punishing downpours caused the worst floods in a century in the Yangtze River Valley and serious floods in other parts of the country.

"It is necessary to mobilize the whole nation to help the flood-stricken areas," Premier Li Peng ordered this week.

The nation has responded with an outpouring of donations that totaled \$48 million — by midweek. Aid pledges totaling \$81 million have come from abroad, mostly from Hong Kong.

The ruling Communist Party, seeking to turn the floods to its advantage, has praised the donors for showing socialist spirit and given more media attention to relief efforts than to the victims.

The party and army are hoping to narrow the breach between them and public created by the 1989 crackdown on a nationwide democracy movement, although it's too early to assess whether they are succeeding.

The floods, they killed at least 1,781 people and left more than 4 million homeless, although officials acknowledge that figures are estimates. Thousands of factories in one of China's key export-producing regions have been shut down for weeks and some may need to replace water-damaged equipment.

The grain crop has been reduced, although estimates vary widely. Provincial officials report more than 13 million tons of grain lost, but the State Statistical Bureau said Monday the summer grain harvest totaled 98 million tons, down 2 million tons

from last year's record.

The Agriculture Ministry warned, however, that the rainy season still has a month to go in most of China, and typhoon season along the southeastern coast, China's most prosperous area, has just started.

In the ministry's worst nightmare, planting for the major autumn harvest could be delayed, undermining the nation's annual struggle for

grain self-sufficiency.

Heavy rains are causing new floods in scattered places, especially lush, mountainous Sichuan province in the southwest and Jilin in the northeast on the border with North Korea.

But authorities' greatest attention is focused on recovery work along the lower reaches of the Yangtze, where the worst disaster unfolded in

early July.

The region, one of China's most densely-inhabited, is both a breadbasket and an industrial center.

The rains began in Jiangsu and neighboring Anhui on May 15 and continued with short breaks until July 13.

By then, some places had received 68 inches of rain, more than usually falls in an entire year.

U.S. general offers to help Soviet Army

MOSCOW (AP) — Gen. Colin Powell, chairman of the U.S.-Soviet Chiefs of Staff, said Thursday the United States military is prepared to advise and assist the Soviet army in converting its assets to civilian use.

Powell is on a six-day tour of military facilities, the first in a series of formal exchanges of top military brass. The visit is unrelated to next week's summit meeting between President Bush and Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

The general told a news conference that it was up to the Soviet Union to help itself cut back on the huge amounts of cash that flows to the military-industrial complex.

He said the U.S. military could help the Soviets convert military enterprises to civilian use. "We can assist, we can give advice," he said, "but in the final analysis, they must make the judgment on converting."

On Wednesday, Powell visited the Soviet Military Academy of the General Staff.

Germany to use jets

BOSS, Germany (AP) — Germany has decided to use advanced Soviet MiG-29 fighter jets and hundreds of armored personnel carriers it inherited from former East Germany, a Defense Ministry spokesman said Thursday.

The German military took over the 24 MiG-29s, along with other Soviet-built military equipment, once owned by former Communist state when the two Germans united last year.

After testing the MiG-29s, the military said the planes proved to be reliable high performance aircraft, said the industry spokesman, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Start of Odiaga trial delayed

BOISE — Mitchell John Odiaga's day in court is not at hand. The process of picking a jury to decide the fate of Odiaga, charged with the June 22, 1990, drive-by slaying of two men on the streets of Ketchum, will move into its fifth day this morning. But it will be at least Aug. 5 before the trial gets under way in the Blaine County Courthouse in Hailey, and perhaps later.

That's because 5th District Judge James May granted Blaine County Prosecutor

Ned Williamson an extra week to digest new evidence submitted by Odiaga's attorneys earlier in the week.

And jury selection, a time-consuming process that includes individual interviews of all prospective jurors by both prosecution and defense attorneys, could stretch into next week or later, further delaying the trial.

The jury is being chosen in Ada County because May ruled publicity about the case would make it impossible to find an impartial jury in Blaine County.

Williamson said Thursday the evidence he needs more time to study includes psychological test results and transcripts.

Odiaga's mental condition will be the focus of the trial, especially since his own attorneys told prospective jurors their client was indeed in the man who killed Jerold "Shenanandoth" Wright and Bruce Fate Schaffer in Ketchum last summer.

Odiaga is charged with two counts of first-degree murder in the slayings of

Wright, a 47-year-old Ketchum handyman, and Schaffer, a 23-year-old architecture student from Burley.

Prosecutors say Odiaga planned the killings. Defense attorneys insist he is schizophrenic and was hallucinating that night.

Odiaga, a 36-year-old former Boise postal worker with a history of mental problems, was originally judged incompetent to stand trial and was ordered to undergo psychological treatment that includes taking drugs to control his mental

LaRocco's medallion bill wins subcommittee approval

WASHINGTON — A bill to award a silver medallion to the service men and women who took part in the Persian Gulf War has won unanimous approval from a House subcommittee and will go to the full House on Monday.

It's the first bill sponsored by freshman Rep. Larry LaRocco, D-Idaho.

The bill authorizes Congress to award a silver medallion to all troops that took part in Operation Desert Storm, although it is not designed to take the place of any military medals.

LaRocco said Thursday it will use 500,000 ounces of stockpiled silver, which should help depressed prices in an industry which is badly depressed.

More than half of the House members are cosponsors, LaRocco said.

The medallion is to be financed by public sales of a bronze duplicate metal.

LaRocco said he suggested that the medallion design should specifically highlight the role women played in the American success in the Gulf.

"I think that a medallion which points out the contribution of women in the field might be very popular," he said.

Coordinator Blaine Russell also has a mystery event planned. Everyone is eligible to compete.

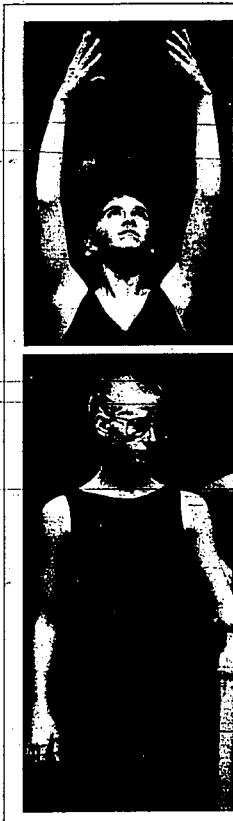

Rupert may ban poultry

RUPERT — Poultry and fowl are likely to be banned from within Rupert's city limits after a six-week controversy about fighting coo.

A proposal to expand the list of farm animals banned by ordinance within city limits to include fowl and poultry will be reviewed at the next Rupert City Council meeting, scheduled for 5 p.m. Aug. 5.

The current ordinance prohibits large animals such as horses, cattle, sheep, and goats within Residential Zone A areas except upon parcels larger than a half acre.

City attorney Don Chisholm said the city has the ability to ban fowl and poultry because they are "detrimental to health and safety."

"We are within the rights of using the police power," Chisholm said. "Odor, noise and insects are good, valid reasons for banning it."

Chisholm suggested that no grandfather rights be given because once exceptions are made others may ask for and receive them. When you create exceptions, you create problems, Chisholm said.

Fungicide causes no apparent damage

RUPERT — About a quart of a fungicide used to treat potatoes for blight spilled into the Snake River on Wednesday, but did not kill any fish or plants, a Mindoka County fire chief says.

"It is like a drop in the bucket," said Terry Tracy, the county's East End fire chief.

The concentrated fungicide, copper ammonium carbonate sold under the trade name Copper Count-N, spilled from two 20-

gallon plastic containers that probably dropped off the back of a pickup late Wednesday, Tracy said.

A caller reported the spill about 11 p.m. No one has claimed responsibility, Tracy said.

The pesticide ran down two gutters on Montgomery Bridge, which is four miles east of Rupert on East Base Line Road, he said. Eleven firefighters built a dam to stop the chemical from getting into the river and after contacting the Idaho Division of Environmental Quality, they soaked the

pesticide up and took it to the landfill in garbage cans, Tracy said.

Copper Count-N is sprayed out of airplanes during the early part of the potato-growing season to treat blight, he said. It would take a spill of about 200 to 300 gallons of the fungicide to kill fish and plants, Tracy said. The 1987 Farm Chemicals Handbook lists its toxicity as low.

Tom Askew, a hazardous waste compliance officer for DEQ, said the spill was classified as a minor incident with little if any impact.

BLM will let brush fire burn

SHOSHONE — A lightning-caused brush fire near Craters of the Moon National Monument will be allowed to burn naturally, the Bureau of Land Management decided Thursday.

BLM lookouts spotted the blaze burning atop North Lardlaw Butte — located approximately 15 miles south of the national monument — at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday. As of Thursday, the size of the fire was estimated at 10 acres.

Since the fire is located within the Great Rift Wilderness Study Area, no suppressor action will be taken "unless it exhibits potential for escaping the Great Rift," said Steve Ellis, BLM area manager on the Shoshone district.

Ellis explained that the North Lardlaw Butte is surrounded by lava fields at least a mile wide. The most fire likely will burn is 100 acres.

Fires in the Shoshone District's wilderness study areas are managed under the Great Rift Fire Management Plan of 1980, which includes a "let-burn" policy for naturally-caused fires within their boundaries.

Buhl City Council opens budget to receive money already spent

BULH. — In a special meeting held this week, Buhl's City Council opened up the current year's budget to make an amendment to it, and receive \$56,303 in revenue.

Most of this money already has been spent on completed city projects.

The city was expecting these funds to come in and incur the expenses of projects until the funds arrived. Then it became necessary to open up the budget to "balance" the revenues for the current fiscal year.

\$46,803 is from an Idaho Community Development Block grant, \$7,500 is from a state Health and Welfare Department grant for a waste-water feasibility study, and \$2,000 is a carry over in library funds.

After addressing the current year's budget matters, council members heard the last three reports on requested funding for the 1991-92 year at their budget workshop.

Public Works Director Gary Winn presented the budget requests for the water and wastewater departments, and Peggy McAlhara, city clerk, presented the administrative budget request.

No figures were released, but the preliminary budget will be made public soon.

The City Council has heard all individual departments' budget requests and now will work toward combining them into one preliminary budget. Council members will have one more budget workshop on Aug. 5.

Then council members must decide on a preliminary budget Aug. 12. Following that, there will be public hearings on the matter and the City Council must adopt the 1991-92 budget by the second week in September, shortly before fiscal year end.

Idaho Power hurt by bad water year

BOISE — The impact of a fifth consecutive poor water year is showing up in Idaho Power Company's operating reports.

The utility said this week in the first half of the year it was able to generate just over half of its electricity at hydroelectric plants, compared with 72 percent in a normal water year.

Coal-fired generating plants provided 40.2 percent of its power and the company had to buy 9.3 percent from outside sources.

In a normal water year, the company generates 28 percent of its power at coal-fired plants and usually has enough surplus power available to sell to outside sources.

Out-system purchases reflect the company's ability to buy surplus electricity in the Pacific Northwest

at costs lower than incurred by burning coal.

The company said it added 3,073 new customers in the first half of the year, down considerably from last year, when it added 3,964 in the same period.

The gain of 2,301 residential customers was down 25 percent from the year earlier.

In the last five years, Idaho Power said, its Hailey district showed the

FBI agent says defendant was photographed at nuclear plant

PRESCOTT, Ariz. (AP) — An FBI agent testified Thursday in a nuclear sabotage conspiracy trial that defendant Mark Davis was photographed by FBI agents in 1989 as he looked at electric transmission towers near a California nuclear facility.

Special Agent L. Steve Powell told jurors in U.S. District Court that a six-member FBI surveillance team from Los Angeles followed Davis to the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Generating Facility near San Luis Obispo on April 25, 1989.

Davis, Dave Foreman, Margaret "Peg" Millet, Ise Asplund and Marc Baker are environmental activists charged with conspiring to damage nuclear facilities in Arizona, California and Colorado.

Davis, Baker, Millet and Asplund — all Prescott residents — additionally face various property destruction charges stemming from acts of sabotage against the Central Arizona Main, the Snow Bowl ski resort near Flagstaff and Central Arizona Project power lines in 1987 and 1988.

Foreman, a Tucson resident who co-founded the radical environmental group "Earth First," but says he

split from it last year, is accused of providing the alleged fellow conspirators with money, literature and know-how for sabotage acts.

The government alleges that the five defendants planned to eventually damage power lines serving Diablo Canyon, the Palo Verde Nuclear Generating Station in Arizona and the Rocky Flats nuclear facility in Colorado.

Powell testified that Davis stopped his van at the Diablo Canyon's main entrance, then drove to three separate side roads: While on the first road, Davis took about 15 minutes and "stood at the base looking up, looking down," Powell said.

Davis then climbed to the base of an electric transmission tower on the second road for about 10 minutes, where he was photographed. On the third road, he drove under power lines slowly, Powell testified.

"Davis and Foreman were the only vehicles on the road," Powell said of the six agents in five cars and one van who took turns as the lead or "point" vehicle in the surveillance.

Diablo security guard John Jakes testified that a man came to the entrance of the nuclear facility that day

in 1989 and asked about hiking in the area. However, Jakes could not identify the man in court.

"He looked like a hippie that was possibly living in the van he was driving," Jakes said.

A few minutes after the man left, Jakes was approached by an FBI agent and recalled his comments to Davis.

No parole for pedophile

BOISE (AP) — Children are "society's most vulnerable members" and must be protected from people who prey on them, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

The court on Thursday refused to change the prison term of seven 1/2 years ordered in a Kootenai County case for a man who pleaded guilty to sexually molesting a 4-year-old boy.

Thomas Lynn Snow said he received favorable reports when he was evaluated at the North Idaho Correctional Institute in a program that could have led to probation. But based on a psychologist's report that Snow did not appear amenable to treatment and was a high risk to re-offend again, the institution recommended prison.

The court agreed with Judge James Judd that Snow had shown little indication he wanted to be rehabilitated. "By the sentence imposed, Snow will be forced to contemplate the seriousness of his actions," the court said.

Auditor: Revenue growth short of estimate, but economy strong

BOISE (AP) — State tax receipts grew at a slower pace than analysts expected during the 1991 budget year, due largely to the fallout from the national recession.

But the official figures released Thursday showed that cash in the state treasury during the year that ended June 30 still outpaced expenditures by \$26.9 million, and state Auditor J.D. Williams declared Idaho's tax base very strong.

"We have declined to participate in the nation's recession, and we continue to grow at a very manageable rate," Williams said.

That figure was \$3.9 million less than state lawmakers projected, and \$6.6 million below the Andrus administration forecast.

While the state was able to pay its bills with some cash left over during the past year, lawmakers had anticipated an even larger cash surplus when they wrote the current state budget.

The smaller surplus, coupled with the fact that lawmakers spent \$8 million more than they originally thought they would have, creates the possibility that revenue will fall nearly \$12 million short of budgeted expenditures by the end of next June.

That situation could be further aggravated by any emergency spending demands lawmakers must deal

with next winter. Administration officials estimate now that those emergency appropriations could "push possibly total ask over \$16 million."

But Gov. Cecil Andrus, who vetoed \$5.7 million in proposed spending after lawmakers adjourned this spring, remained confident serious budget problems can be avoided.

"We can handle it," he said just after Williams released the financial report. "I'll wait and see how we

progress and what we think we can have. But we've got flexibility yet."

Administration economists will retest their revenue estimate for the current budget year next month, and while the lower than expected tax receipts in the last year will probably affect the forecast, the new administration estimate was still expected to total more than the \$949.3 million the Legislature used in reaching spending decisions.

While Idaho's economy was one of the few in the nation to escape the recession, the state's rate of expansion did slow from the previous few years. But Commerce Director James Hawkins was optimistic economic expansion will gain more strength in the coming months.

"What we're seeing is a broad base of continued growth across the state," he said. "I fell very good about what Idaho is doing in general at the grassroots level."

The areas we targeted four years ago in manufacturing, high tech, are working. We know we have trouble in some areas like the mining business, but at least we're not relying on just one area.

Personal income tax collections, which account for nearly half of all general tax revenues each year, jumped 8.5 percent during the last budget year, exceeding both legislative and administration expectations. But coupled with better than expected performance from investment earnings and miscellaneous revenue sources, that growth rate was not enough to offset only a 5.1 percent expansion in sales tax receipts, the second largest contributor to the state treasury.

Administration Budget Director Charles Moss blamed the lower than expected performance of the sales tax on consumer jitters prompted by the Persian Gulf War and the recession, that swept through most other states.

Group says Forest Service in violation

BOISE — Two Montana-based environmental groups have accused the U.S. Forest Service of violating the federal Wild and Scenic Rivers Act by approving construction of a hunting lodge on the Salmon River.

Wilderness Watch and Five Valleys Audubon, both based in Missoula, Mont., filed a lawsuit Monday in U.S. District Court contending the Forest Service violated the law by approving the log lodge and several guest cabins in 1988.

The suit also alleges that former Salmon National Forest supervisor Richard Hauff authorized the lodge's construction without adequate public review.

Forest Service officials at the Northern Region headquarters in Missoula, Mont., declined comment Wednesday.

Researchers check out contamination

MOSCOW — University of Idaho researchers are studying how far contamination from underground storage tanks extends beneath the Moscow campus and whether it has reached ground water.

The university last year removed three tanks that once stored pesticide, gasoline and diesel fuel. They were abandoned 10 to 15 years ago, Fred Hutchinson, the university's safety officer, said Wednesday.

Faculty and graduate students in the Idaho Water Resources Research Institute and Hazardous Waste Remediation Research Center will begin assessing the sites next month by drilling four or five test wells.

County wants pathologist to find clues

DUBOIS — Clark County authorities hope a forensic pathologist can come up with clues to a 12-year-old homicide mystery by studying the torso of a dismembered man exhumed Wednesday.

The Clark County sheriff's department dug up the torso from an unmarked grave in the Dubois Cemetery.

People digging for artifacts in 1974 found the torso wrapped in a burlap bag in a lava tube cave north of Dubois. This spring, arms and legs believed to belong to the same body were found in the cave.

Authorities, who believe the man may have been the victim of a homicide in the 1970s, are still looking for the head.

Mismanagement investigation begins

IDAHO FALLS — State investigators have launched an inquiry into allegations of mismanagement at Eastern Idaho Technical College.

Trudy Anderson, administrator of the state Division of Vocational Education in Boise, said two members of her staff will interview former students, faculty and staff who have aired complaints about EITC administrators. "The two-day investigation is scheduled to wind up Friday."

"Their purpose is to get to the bottom of this, if there is anything," she said. A report is expected to be ready next week.

Young offender sits with Owyhee sheriff

MURPHY (AP) — Since he was arrested here a week ago, a 17-year-old juvenile offender from Homedale has been sitting, under guard, at a small table at the sheriff's office.

At night, he sleeps on mattress next to the table. Owyhee County Sheriff Tim Nettleton says he has no other place to put the youth, and that may be where he stays until a court date in August.

The youth was arrested about 10 p.m. July 19 and charged with several area burglaries. Nettleton said state law doesn't allow him to put juveniles in with adult offenders.

Usually, youths are released to parents or guardians. In this case, however, the guardians don't want him back.

The sheriff said the youth has five prior felony convictions and has spent time in juvenile facilities in St. Anthony and in Orofino. He said the youth was caught with stolen property in his home, warned about the serious situation he was in, and released. Six hours later, the youth

allegedly committed another burglary and was arrested.

The state Health and Welfare agency is responsible for finding a place to put the boy, Nettleton said. But because of the prior convictions and the fact that the guardians cannot control him, the agency could come up only with an unsecured facility in Coeur d'Alene, far from Murphy where he would make his court appearances.

"I've got some sympathy for Health and Welfare. They're in the same shape I am," Nettleton said. "They've been given a job to do by law and no mechanism to do it with."

The sheriff says one of the roots of the juvenile problem is that of fenders know the system isn't designed to punish them, and they can get away with almost anything until they turn age 18.

He also said the state made a big mistake in banning the housing of juvenile offenders with adults before it made sure there were facilities to do it.

Pocatello school offers doctorate

POCATELLO (AP) — Idaho's first doctorate degree program in clinical psychology will begin accepting students at Idaho State University in 1993.

The program was approved by the state Board of Education in June and will begin seeking funding next year.

At capacity, the five-year-pro-

gram will enroll doctorate students with six new students accepted each year.

The curricula will include 70 credits of course work and 52 credits of practical, research, thesis or dissertation, and internships. Accreditation will be sought from the American Psychological Association.

Few clues in autopsy

EMMETT (AP) — Gem County Coroner Walter Potter said a preliminary autopsy report on a baby boy found in a portable toilet Monday doesn't indicate whether the child was stillborn, or died after birth.

Potter said Wednesday that the baby, found by a maintenance worker at the Gem County Fairgrounds, was a full-term infant and exhibited "no congenital abnormalities." The report was prepared by a Boise pathologist who conducted the autopsy. Potter said the report didn't indicate whether the baby suffered any trauma or other signs of injury.

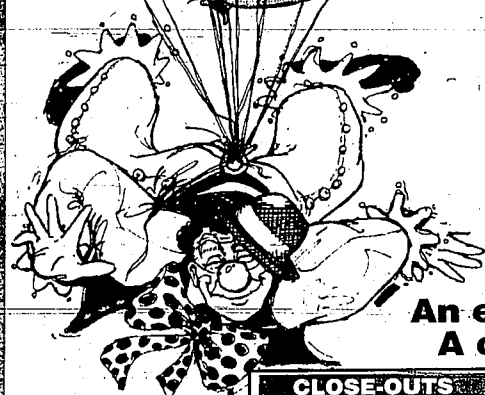

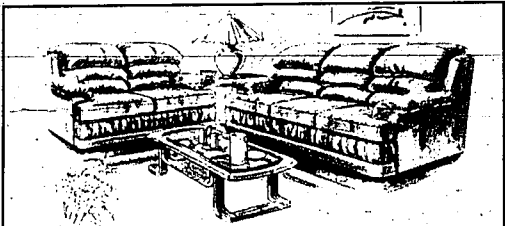

LOS ANGELES — Joe Regalbuto is hoping the success of "Murphy Brown" will lead to starring roles in television movies, but he recognizes that being in a hit can have some drawbacks.

"I don't know what's tougher — being unknown-or-being known," said Regalbuto, who played reporter Frank Fontana in the successful CBS comedy series. "You have to constantly reinvent yourself."

always wondered what real value anything has as far as making you more marketable. ... He's starting to find out, with the completion of a starring role with Morgan Fairchild in a USA Network movie called "Writer's Block" that

"I can certainly say 'Murphy Brown' doesn't hurt, although being in a sitcom can hurt you," Regalbuto said. "But Frank is a three-dimensional character. He's open to a lot of possibilities. Still, you wonder what people in this town remember. If you do a character well, you can sometimes be punished for it. They say you're that character. They don't always see it as an acting job, and everyone is so afraid to make the final choice because so much money is involved."

"There are so few people who can guarantee big numbers in television or at the box office. That's been proven again and again. ... Regalbuto wants bigger and better roles, but said he enjoys "Murphy Brown," the people he works with, the exposure, and the big boost he's gotten from being in a hit.

"I'm really fond of Frank," he said. "He's such a misfit in many ways. The thing I like about him is that he has a cynical viewpoint. He's very sharp. He's a great reporter. I love his friendship with Murphy." On his way back from a trip to the kitchen in his airy house, he gestured toward a painting of his wife, Rosemary, who is the director of Meals on Wheels in Santa Monica. The couple has three children. ... "She's optimistic, she never gets depressed," he said of his wife. "She's always had complete faith in my career. She's always supportive."

Regalbuto, who was born in Brooklyn, grew up in the Bronx and New Milford, N.J. He attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and did two years alternative service at the New York University Medical Center during the Vietnam War. 1970s. "I mean, everything from MTV to CNN to ESPN sort of encourages what everybody calls zapping. That's something that I wouldn't say is necessarily a positive thing, although it's good for us."

But there's also more to MTV than a zap-happy sensibility. Without MTV, said Herzog, you might never have seen NBC's "Fresh Prince of Bel Air" or the hip, irreverent style of various fourth network programs on Fox, "In Living Color" and "The Simpsons" come immediately to mind.

"The amazing thing is, MTV is just keeps reinventing itself. And in nearly every way, it is a far more lively and creative MTV in 1991 than it was in 1981."

"I think there's really one central reason for the influence that we've had in that's that, as have our children, to 'grow old' with our audience, says the way Rolling Stone has," said MTV creative director Judy McGrath. "We've stayed young."

More importantly, MTV has evolved from a blah, mostly white-bread channel into an energetic source of multicultural mojo.

"Michael Jackson exploded the entire thing," said Herzog. "That happened in 1983 when Jackson's phenomenally successful 'Thriller' became the blockbuster album event of the decade. And MTV climbed on board."

"Such trend-setting Jackson videos as 'Billie Jean' and 'Beat It' helped ignite a fresh wave of music video creativity. And it opened the MTV doors for real diversity."

Without Michael Jackson to lead the way, you would never have wound up with shows like "Yo! MTV Raps" or "Clot" MTV, or weekend blocks of dance-oriented, African-American energized dance videos.

"It's clearly a different MTV than we were 10 years ago in terms of the music we program," Herzog said. "The present-day MTV plays rock, alternative, rap, dance, heavy metal, hard rock. You name it, we play it."

MTV is also far more enjoyably eclectic and eclectic than it was 10 years ago.

Talented film directors such as Spike Lee, Jonathan Demme and Martin Scorsese have created rock videos. Former Rolling Stone senior editor Kurt Loder has brought an intelligent edge and a critical slant to his sharp-eyed reports on "MTV News."

And from a goofy, TV-generation game show like "Remote Control" to such innovative documentary specials as "Sex in the City" and the upcoming "Racing in Joints of View," MTV has displayed a refreshing willingness to experiment with new ways of doing TV.

Simultaneously, MTV has enjoyed vast commercial success. The bottom line is booming.

The brand name identity alone is invaluable. "We're a mass medium, pop culture entertainment entity," McGrath said.

When it started in 1981, MTV had scanty 2.1 million subscribers.

Now it's a global video dance party. MTV has more than 200 million subscribers in 40 countries and five continents, including Europe, Japan, South America and Australia. MTV in Europe has even become the first non-Soviet channel cranking out programming 24 hours a day in Leningrad. Rock 'n' roll poked to Russia! You betula.

Besides the mainstreaming of hip-hop culture and rap artists, MTV has become a firm, stiff, virile genre performer as ZZ Top, Madonna and Paula Abdul into superstars.

But in addition to creating celebrities, MTV has regularly whipped up its share of controversy. Pop professors and feminists have often railed against MTV's video blotto excesses — among their most scorching and deserved criticism at the rock videos awash in violence and lingerie-wearing hormone-kitten stereotypes.

Even though the business, literal

videos are decreasing, the anti-MTV bid goes on.

"One person's sexy is another person's sexist," said MTV's Herzog, who oversees the selection process of videos for the network.

Both McGrath and Herzog freely admit MTV has made mistakes. But choosing which rock videos to air isn't a science.

Recently, a large multi-system cable operator in Texas pulled the plug on MTV, slamming the channel as "borderline pornography."

"Just this last week, you could see MTV in Russia but not in Texas," said McGrath, bemused by the rather surreal development.

The blackout won't last long. The Lone Star state controversy has quickly simmered down, and MTV says it will be back on the air on most Texas cable systems within 30 days.

"It's always been the role of rock 'n' roll to be provocative and to not be to everyone's liking," McGrath said.

Besides, the Texas snafu riled the silent MTV majority, McGrath said. "I think it made people very active again about saying, 'Look, I want to make my own decisions. I want to choose what I watch on TV. I'm responsible. I want MTV.'"

Whether it's Texas or Tokyo, Leningrad or Louisville, most MTV viewers are satisfied customers of the world's No. 1 video juke joint. And MTV is one 10-year-old with a cosmic recognition factor.

"101 Dalmatians," first released in 1961, has proved to be one of the more popular Disney animated features — so popular that it has never been released as a videocassette and so popular that the studio re-releases it to theaters every few years.

"101 Dalmatians" is vintage Disney, and small children always take it to it. Of course, they have to be very small. The cartoon feature is probably sweet. The puppies are playful, adorable and obedient.

The film features Cruella De Vil, a cigarette-smoking villainess, plotting to steal all the Dalmatian pups she can. She has managed, by the time the film is half through, to get her hands on 99 pups, animals she

would kill and skin to make herself a fur coat, maybe several.

Yes, that's surprisingly cruel, considering the film was done 30 years ago, but rest assured it is never in the same league with "Silence of the Lambs."

Fifteen of the Dalmatian pups belong to a struggling songwriter who, when the pups are finally rescued, writes the title song that sounds very much like a song from the "Annie" score, one that came along 16 years later.

"101 Dalmatians" is excellent cartooning. It has fluidity that most animated features do not have. Take the kids — the very young ones.

'Terminator' stays atop box office for 3rd week

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "Terminator 2: Judgment Day" throttled its movie competitors for the third straight weekend as the Arnold Schwarzenegger adventure film collected \$14.9 million for first place at the box office.

With ticket sales to date of \$115.3 million, the film has emerged as the summer's biggest hit.

Cartoon strikes a chord with baby boomers

Children of the 1950s might be hard pressed to whistle the theme songs to "Sleeping Beauty" or "Cinderella" or just about any of the Disney animated features that saw them through their formative years.

But mention the title "101 Dalmatians," and perfectly solid citizens well into their 30s are likely to launch into a chorus of "Dalmatian Plantation" or to sing you the lyric that rhymes with "Cruella De Vil."

There's no question about it: Something about the 1961 Disney movie "101 Dalmatians" struck a chord with the baby-boom generation. And the release of the now-classic feature-length cartoon has today's grown-ups turning childish once again.

Maybe it was all those animals, not only Pongo and Perdita and the 99 puppies but also the bloodhound named Towser and the shaggy mixed breed Colonel and the cat named Sergeant Tibs. Maybe it was the wonderfully menacing glamour of Cruella De Vil, the chain-smoking, wildly coddled villainess who steals the 99 puppies and tries to have them made into a spotted fur coat.

And maybe it was the oddly sophisticated humor of the movie, which still makes it just as entertaining for an adult as it is for a child.

"101 Dalmatians" never really consciously did his films for children," said Marc Davis, the animator who created Cruella De Vil and was one of Walt Disney's "nine old men," the backbone of his animation team.

"He was always aiming for an adult audience," said Davis, who

worked for Disney's studio from 1935 until he retired in 1978. "We did the films, and we liked them, too."

Based on a children's book by Dodie Smith, "101 Dalmatians" features a script by Bill Peet (himself a prolific children's author) and an animation technique, near at the time, that allowed the artists' drawings to be transferred directly to celluloid. The resulting film — made for the relatively small sum of \$3.6 million, compared to the \$6 million for "Sleeping Beauty" two years before — appealed to audiences both for its simplicity and its wit.

In "The Disney Studio Story" (Crown, 1988), authors Richard Hollis and Brian Sibley point out that "101 Dalmatians" relied on sophisticated humor rather than comic gags and melodious sentimentality. At the time of its release, Time magazine's movie critic called it "the witziest, most charming, least pretentious cartoon feature Walt Disney has ever made."

Still, the cult following "that surrounds '101 Dalmatians' is a continual surprise to some of those who played key roles in the making of the film. Betty Lou Gerson, the veteran actress who contributed the voice of Cruella De Vil, says that her character has become a popular one at Halloween parties, where baby boomers struggle to get the black-and-white hair, the long cigarette holder and the flowing fur coat just right.

"I had no idea she'd become this cult figure," said Gerson, who had a long career in radio and television before she born the voice of Cruella De Vil. She in Chattanooga, Tenn., and reared in Birmingham.

Ala., she had already done the narration for "Arendella" when she read for "101 Dalmatians."

"I came in with a bit of flair," said Gerson, whose dramatic voice for Cruella was likened to that of fellow Alabamian Tallulah Bankhead. "We were both Southerners, with a phony theater accent on top of it."

Her voice immediately clicked; she said, with animator Davis.

"That voice was the greatest thing I've ever had a chance to work with," she said. "A voice like this gives you something to do. You get a performance going there, and if you don't take advantage of it you're off your rocker."

Davis explains the timeless appeal of Cruella by observing that she's one of the few Disney villains who isn't magic: "She's just a mean broad," he said.

And he points out that there is probably more humor in "101 Dalmatians" than in anything else Disney ever did. Davis particularly enjoyed working on a scene, he said, at Cruella's family mansion, Hell Hall, in which her two henchmen, the Badutis, are watching TV and one of

them, Jasper, is drinking gin. She grabs the bottle out of his hand, and then she just slaps the hell out of him," Davis said with a laugh.

And Cruella's final, defeated splutter of outrage is silenced, he said, with a particularly modern touch: Jasper looks at her and says, in exasperation, "Aw, shut up."

No doubt those moments will delight the 35- and 40-year-olds who may have been no bigger than Pongo and Perdita when they first saw the film — just as it did Betty Lou Gerson, who said she "was charmed by it all over again."

And no doubt some of them will leave humming the tune to the movie's canines watch on TV, or crowning the words to "Cruella De Vil" — words that may not rank with the lyrics of Cole Porter or John Lennon but still have a special place in a baby boomer's heart. For the record, here they are:

"Cruella De Vil, Cruella De Vil, If she doesn't get you, no evil thing will. She's like a spider waiting for the kill. Look out for Cruella De Vil."

Helping fish migrate upriver

Gem governor says he'll lend support to reverse federal decision

BOISE — Gov. Cecil Andrus is joining the critics of a federal regulatory decision doing away with protections for fish migrating downstream, calling the action "sheer stupidity."

"But it doesn't surprise me," Andrus acknowledged Thursday. "This just demonstrates once again the sheer stupidity of the members of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, who live in that rarefied atmosphere inside the beltway back there."

And the governor said he would join forces with other states and conservation agencies in trying to convince the commission to reverse its May decision to limit its regulations protecting fishways only to upstream migration.

The result is that private dams seeking new or renewed federal power generation licenses will no longer be required to erect fish screens or construct fish bypasses to protect salmon and other fish from being swept into turbines as they move downstream.

The decision came as the National Marine Fisheries Service was recommending protection under the Endangered Species Act for four runs of Northwest salmon.

Some conservation groups have blamed the dividing runs on excessive mortality of young fish moving downstream through the Columbia and lower Snake river dam system to the ocean. The Snake action, critics charged, will only aggravate that problem.

"They don't seem to understand that if you're going to have a big fish swim upstream, prior to that you have to a small swim downstream," Andrus said.

"It shows the absolute sterile thought process that seems to prevail in that agency," he said.

"We'll join in any educational process needed to bring those people into the 20th century." But they're going to have to hurry because we're almost into the 21st century."

For nearly a year, Northwest officials have been conducting a concentrated search for some method of restoring the runs without creating severe economic disruption for the region through dramatic changes in management of the river system.

But no consensus has been reached.

The games arrive just in time. Tempers have been flaring on the field and coaches have had to break up fights on the field between San Francisco and Chicago teammates.

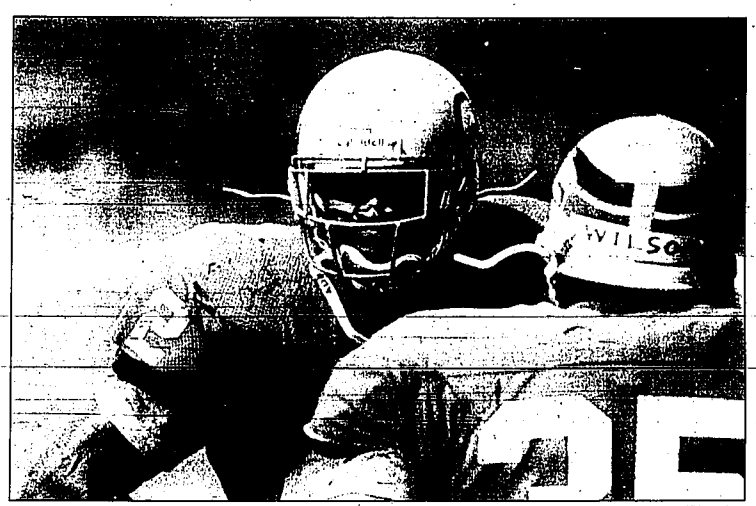

The Browns have lost in each of their four Super Bowl appearances, three with Elway at quarterback.

Last season's Super Bowl losers, the Buffalo Bills, open up in London against Philadelphia in the first of the three-game American Bowl series. The other American Bowl games are scheduled for a week from Saturday with the Bears playing San Francisco at Berlin and the Raiders against Miami in Tokyo.

Other teams continue in camp, trying to fill lineup holes. For Cleveland, the solution to the search for a right tackle may well have been on the team's roster all along.

Dan Fike, who started 70 consecutive games for the Browns at right guard from 1986 through much of the 1989 season, has begun working out at right tackle.

Inductee Schramm expects exciting football future

CANTON, Ohio — Tex Schramm's only regret after 43 years of NFL service is that he couldn't do more.

Schramm, architect of the Dallas Cowboys' powerhouse teams in the 1960s, '70s and '80s, will be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame Sunday. Joining him will be guard John Hannah, running back Earl Campbell, linebacker Stan Jones and kicker Jan Stenerud.

"The reason the NFL became popular is because its growth totally coincided with television's," says Schramm, an assistant sports director at CBS before joining the Los Angeles Rams as a publicity director in 1947. "Growth of American football around Europe and around the world is going to be

very exciting. And of course, it's going to be in the forefront of world television."

However, Schramm says he enjoys going out on his fishing boat, visiting his grandchildren and talking to old friends.

House measure seen as prod to initiate reforms in NCAA

WASHINGTON — A restructuring of the NCAA to give it monopoly control over broadcasting of all college sports while directing revenue away from basketball and football was part of a bill introduced Thursday in the House.

But the measure by Rep. Tom McMillan, D-Md., was viewed more as a prod to the NCAA to raise the academic performance of college athletes and adopt other reforms rather than legislation that has a chance of becoming law.

"The key to reforming intercollegiate athletics is getting the money," said McMillan, a former pro basketball player with the Atlanta Hawks and Washington Bullets and a collegiate standout at Maryland. "Obviously, this kind of vehicle will stimulate the debate."

McMillan outlined the proposal just prior to a hearing on the graduation rates of student athletes before the House Energy and Commerce Committee's consumer protection subcommittee.

"The panel's chairwoman, Rep. Cardiss Collins, D-Ill., complained that the NCAA and its member schools get "zillions of dollars" from sports but spend too little of it on tutoring athletes, particularly blacks from inner cities, most in need of remedial help.

But University of Southern California basketball coach George Raveling said just the contrary is more typical.

"You have to work at not getting a degree if you're a student-athlete," Raveling said, citing the exclusive tutors and other programs provided to students with athletic scholarships on many campuses.

DALLAS — A former Baylor basketball player filed a \$3 million lawsuit accusing former Baylor coach Jim Haller of helping him purchase steroids and inducing him to take the drug.

The lawsuit, filed Wednesday by John Wheeler in Dallas County District Court, names Haller, Baylor and Haller's current employer, MBank N.A. in Waco, as defendants.

Wheeler, 27, and his mother, Nina Wheeler, are listed as plaintiffs. The 7-0 center admitted Baylor from 1983-85.

Nina Wheeler contends the steroids contributed to her son's serious health problems. The lawsuit also alleges the coach's "misery and bank indebted

Wheeler into signing a promissory note for a car Wheeler could not afford."

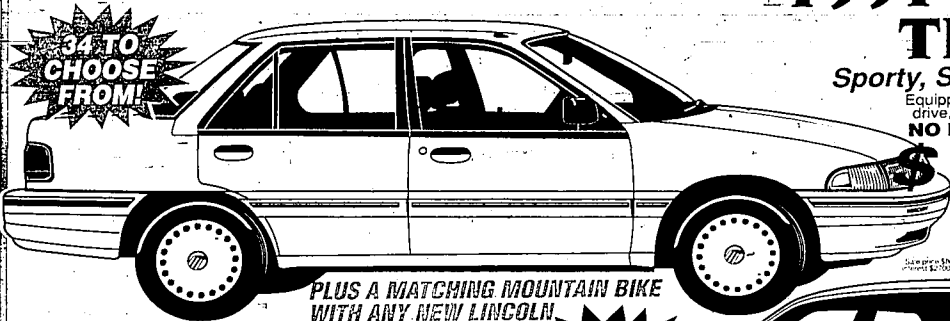
The woman contends that steroids contributed to her son's needing two open-heart operations, one in 1986 and the other six weeks ago.

Wheeler, who has Marfan's Syndrome, is scheduled for another heart operation Aug. 16. Marfan's Syndrome is a hereditary disorder characterized by abnormalities of blood circulation and the eyes, joints and abnormally long bones in the limbs.

"The man is dying," Nina Wheeler said of her son. "The steroids aggravated his aorta veins. The doctors can't go in his chest any more. They're going to have to go through his back, and they said he might not make it. He might be paralyzed," she said.

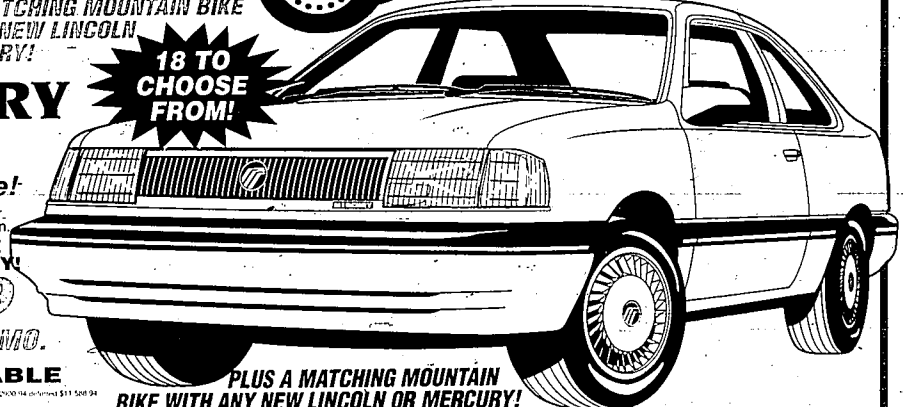

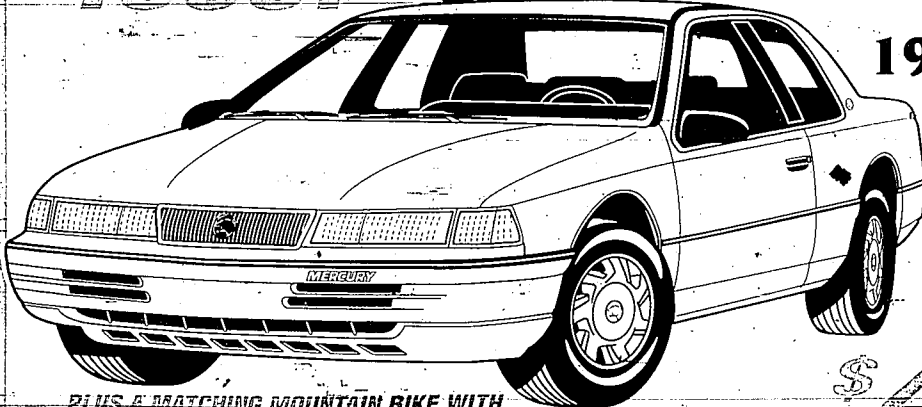

Gloomy economic figures add to fears of double-dip recession

The Associated Press

WASHINGTON — Gloomy economic figures, including a jump in the number of people filing new jobless claims, added to fears Thursday that the country is headed for a double-dip recession rather than the

sustained recovery forecast by the Bush administration.

The Labor Department reported that 300,000 new people filed claims for unemployment benefits from July 30, 1990 to the week ending July 13. It was the second consecutive weekly increase and sent the

weekly number of new claims up to 425,000.

In other economic news, General Motors Corp. and Ford Motor Co., the world's largest automakers, reported a combined loss of about \$1.1 billion for the April-June

quarter, reflecting slumping car sales in the United States.

On Wednesday, the government reported that orders to U.S. manufacturers for durable goods were down a surprisingly sharp 1.6 percent in June and the May advance was not as big as previously thought.

Economists said the weak economic statistics did not shake their view that the overall economy, as measured by the gross national product, will show growth in the second quarter at an annual rate of around 1 percent when the figure is released Friday.

'Doogie Howser' may be farfetched, but it looks like a real season winner

When it came on the air in the fall of 1989, skeptics joked that the last initials in "Doogie Howser, M.D." stood for "Mucho Dumb."

Look who's laughing now. "Doogie Howser, M.D.," a far-fetched TV series about a 16-year-old doctor, will enter its third season this fall. Doogie will turn 18, obtaining some of the privileges of adulthood — yet remaining an infant by medical-community standards. The ABC Wednesday-night series has lasted a lot longer than some people had thought it would. Many critics were as cold as a doctor's stethoscope on the series' chances for survival in the big operating theater of network television, where the prognosis for a rookie series is grim. The notion of a viewing public swallowing the concept of a boy doctor seemed remote.

But "Doogie Howser, M.D." keeps rolling along with ratings that are quite healthy. Teens and young adults, one of the toughest TV audiences to attract, have a series that allows them to live vicariously in an adult world through the main character, played by Neil Patrick Harris. And adults who get past the absurd premise find a show of a certain charm and wit, with stories that deal with such universal themes as acceptance. One reason it works is that Yinnie Delapino, (played by Max Casella), Doogie's manifestly down-to-earth best friend, helps to keep the show grounded.

The challenge now is for executive producer Steven Bochco to keep the premise fresh while allowing the

character of Doogie to grow. An 18-year-old surgeon may still be a boy wonder, but he isn't quite as impressive as a 16-year-old surgeon who has just passed his driver's test.

"I hope the show changes every year," says Bochco. "I think that is one of the neat things about the concept — unlike a lot of shows, which, when they succeed, pretty much get frozen in time and place."

"What I like about this one," Bochco elaborates, "is that it forces us to adjust the series to accommodate the very real fact that Neil, who is 16 like the character is 16, is growing and changing and becoming a young man as opposed to a boy. I see that as a terrific challenge for a group of writers to have to deal with." Bochco, the creator of "Hill Street Blues," got the inspiration for a series from his father.

"My dad was a prodigy," Bochco

told critics when the series was first launched. "He was a violinist. It's just a fascinating freak of nature. They don't really understand why it happens. There's no pattern to it, particularly. It just began rattling around in my head. For some reason, the notion of a kid who by virtue of very specific circumstances had all of those prodigious abilities struck me as real interesting, because the problems in terms of storytelling become so obvious. I think a show like this, assuming an audience accepts the fundamental premise, can be very entertaining for years to come."

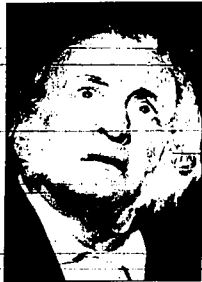

Q: Has Burt Reynolds recovered from his fall from grace as Hollywood's one-time male box-office king? — H.J.

A: Reynolds, 55, was Hollywood's top male movie star from 1977 to 1982. Not even Tom Cruise and Sly Stallone could touch his popularity. Then the fall. Burt overworked himself into ill health. He saw the Rourke fight, and walked out of the third round of the four-round match. Conrad says Rourke is a pushover and that he's ready to take him on — providing the price is right.

ABC unseats CBS in ratings race as viewers choose newsmagazine

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC knocked CBS from the top slot in the latest TV ratings race with a boost from the weekly news-magazine "20/20."

ABC finished first with an 8.9 average rating, followed by NBC with 8.8, according to ratings released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co. CBS, which finished out tied for first the four previous weeks, placed third with an 8.6 average rating.

Each rating point represents 931,000 homes.

A repeat of CBS' venerable news show "60 Minutes" was the No. 1 show on television. ABC's "20/20" placed second. No. 3 was a rerun of NBC's favorite barroom comedy, "Cheers."

An encore of ABC's docudrama movie "A Cry for Help: The Tracy Thurman Story," which portrayed the real-life trauma of a Connecticut woman left paralyzed by her abusive husband, ranked fourth.

NBC's reality-based series "Unsolved Mysteries" was fifth, CBS' original presentation of Stephen King's "Golden Years" miniseries tied for sixth with a rerun of ABC's blue-collar, wisecracking family on "Roseanne." CBS'

TV stresses importance of parents

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. — What's the hardest job in the world? A classified ad for it might read like this: No experience or college degree needed. Entry level positions available for teen-agers, but applicants must be prepared to commit an entire lifetime and be on call 24 hours a day. Out-of-pocket expenses average \$140,000 over a single career. No salary, but emotional rewards are great.

The answer, of course, is parenting, and if the job description strikes home, then you're ready for "The National Parent Quiz," a special that will be aired on public broadcasting stations nationwide this fall.

The one-hour program, taped at Disney-MGM Studios recently

before an audience of almost 200 people, marks the third year of Central Florida public TV station WMFE's Crackdown project, a series of programs aimed at preventing drug abuse. "Parent Quiz" is a subtle form of attack on the problem: Effective parenting, the theory goes, can help kids steer clear of drugs by better arming them against negative influences outside the home.

"Parent Quiz," featuring Harvard law professor Charles Ogletree (best known as moderator of PBS' "Ethics in America") as host and Tony-award winning actor Ben Vereen in a celebrity appearance, is the first program WMFE has produced for national distribution. It is clearly in keeping with a push by public

broadcasters to become more involved in the educational life of their communities.

In "Parent Quiz," Ogletree and a panel that includes Vereen, parents, grandparents, children and family counselors join on a homey-living room set and watch a series of taped vignettes: In one, for example, a father's children nag him to come and play after he arrives home exhausted from work.

In another, parents create conflict by giving their child two sets of rules to follow.

Ogletree shapes the discussion based on panelists' responses to what they see.

Lending his charismatic presence to the production is Broadway star Ben Vereen (Pippin).

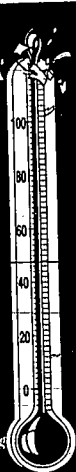

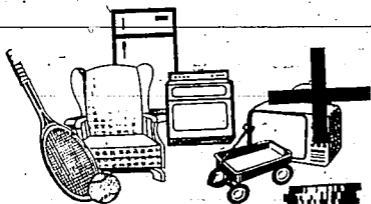
