Hostage release bouys hope

New order emerges in Middle East

WASHINGTON — The release of British hostage John McCarthy in Beirut, Lebanon, Thursday was the result of a series of political changes in the Middle East over the past year that are creating a new balance of power. But the alleged abduction hours later of a French national in Lebanon and the assassination of Iranian opposition leader Shabour Bakhtiar in Paris underscore the volatility of that new order and the opposition to it, according to U.S. officials and Mideast analysts.

Analysis

While U.S. officials remain cautiously optimistic that an American hostage will be released, counterterrorism experts predict the next phase of the hostage drama will be determined by whether the forces shaping the new order in the three most troubled Mideast nations are capable of fending off the "spoilers" and hard-liners.

Several factors have come together to alter the political climate that made hostage abductions the most cost-effective terrorism tactic since the late 1970s: In Lebanon, a new government is gradually restoring law and order and disarming militias that created anarchy for 16 years, squeezing renegade groups like the Islamic Jihad that held McCarthy, along with the broader Hezbollah movement.

In Syria, a facilitator in most recent hostage releases, the government's warmer relationship with the United States during and after the Persian Gulf war and the declining influence of the Soviet Union, have led to a more pragmatic and new pragmatism about dealing with the West — and its priorities — especially on what may be the eve of U.S.-orchestrated peace talks on the broader Arab-Israeli dispute.

And in Iran, which U.S. officials believe provided the main impetus for McCarthy's release, the post-Khomeini regime wants to exploit the new post-gulf war climate — in which Iraq replaced Iran as the region's

McCarthy returns home; another taken

LONDON — Islamic Jihad released British television newsman John McCarthy after more than five years of captivity Thursday, charging him to deliver a secret letter to U.N. Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar with proposals for an end to the cruel chapter of Western hostages in Lebanon.

The release of a second hostage, perhaps American journalist Terry Anderson, who has spent more time under terrorist detention than any other Westerner, was widely expected. The smiling 34-year-old McCarthy,

looking healthy and almost jaunty in an olive polo shirt, arrived in Damascus, Syria, under Syrian military escort after his release by his Islamic fundamentalist captors somewhere in Lebanon. He brought out word that at least three of the dozen hostages left — Anderson, American academic Thomas Sutherland and Church of England officer Terry Waitte — were "in good health and good spirits."

McCarthy, who was en route to the Beirut, Lebanon, airport for a flight to England when seized April 17, 1986, finally made it home aboard a Royal Air Force plane that, after a flight from Damascus alighted at Lyncenhair air force base in Wiltshire west of London Thursday night.

Freedom for McCarthy ushered in a day of dizzying and sometimes confusing activity dealing with the Western hostages still left in control of various pro-Islamist Muslim fundamentalist groups in Lebanon:

At United Nations headquarters in New York, the secretary-general told reporters that he believed that a second hostage, most likely an American, would probably follow McCarthy into freedom soon. McCarthy is expected to deliver the Islamic Jihad letter to Perez de Cuellar in Europe on Sunday.

Perez de Cuellar's optimism about the impending release of an American was soon echoed somewhat by President Bush. But

Hostage families wait, wonder

Relatives of hostages and those who once shared their plight in Lebanon expressed joy Thursday at John McCarthy's freedom, but also anxiety about waiting for the release of another captive.

"My prayer is not that it will be Terry Anderson. My prayer is that it will be all of them," said Anderson's sister, Peggy Say.

McCarthy, freed Thursday from five years of captivity in Lebanon, credited fellow hostages Anderson, Thomas Sutherland and Briton Terry Waitte for giving him the strength to endure. He said the three were "in good health and in good spirits."

"That's certainly a relief, but we don't have any information so far as to how well he is," Sutherland's daughter Kit said in a Colorado radio interview. Virginia Rose Steen said she was

watching for news about her professor husband, Alann, who was captured in Lebanon on Jan. 24, 1987.

"I'm certainly pleased that John has been released. We'll just have to see what he's heard," Mrs. Steen said from her parents' home in Clarklake, Mich.

Such caution, born of repeated disappointment, characterized statements by those working for the hostages' release.

"I would like to be optimistic," McCarthy's former cellmate Frank Reed said in Malden, Mass. "But I still think the Islamic Jihad is doing some messaging that there's another thing on the table to negotiate."

McCarthy said upon arrival in Syria that the shadowy group Islamic Jihad released him with a letter to the United Nations secretary-general asking for help in arranging a full exchange of prisoners and hostages being held in Lebanon and Israel.

Reed, who was released in April 1990 after 44 months in captivity, headed for London and a reunion with McCarthy and former Irish hostage Brian Keenan.

Say also planned to meet with McCarthy. "Because John looks so well, I'm going to get to him as soon as possible," Say said.

In an emotional news conference in her front yard in Cadiz, Ky., Say was asked if President Bush deserves any credit for McCarthy's release.

"It's been years since I have been able to put confidence in an administration official," she replied. But Say praised Secretary of State James A. Baker III, who may have laid the groundwork for a hostage deal in his contacts with Syria and his Middle East peace efforts.

"He's the man who is perfect for this job," Say said.

"All I ever asked of my country is that it care for the hostages. It should have a higher priority," she said.

Ketchum man recalls smooth way gun was aimed at him

HAILEY — Jerry Johnson of Ketchum didn't see a face, but he remembers seeing the gun being aimed at him.

As the prosecution's final witness in the murder case against Mitchell John Odiaga, Johnson showed jurors a man holding a rifle turned, aimed, and fired at him the night of June 22, 1990.

That same night, two men were shot and killed near downtown Ketchum. Odiaga faces two counts of first-degree murder and a charge of attempted murder, plus several other felony charges in connection with the shootings.

Johnson, a computer analyst, gave what Blaine County Prosecutor Ned Williamson called "the most dramatic evidence" that

Odiaga intended to commit those crimes. Johnson said he was driving to the office just before 10 p.m. when he spotted a man standing next to a car.

As he drove closer, Johnson said, he realized the man was holding a rifle. With a smooth motion, the man turned and aimed the gun at Johnson, he said, using the alleged murder weapon to show the jury what he saw.

"At the time, it seemed very methodical," Johnson said.

When he saw the gun aimed at him, Johnson ducked. "I heard kind of an explosion," he said. A bullet crashed through the driver's side window, nicked Johnson's thumb and passed out the passenger's side door.

Johnson said he drove on and never

Researchers isolate mutilated gene that causes colon cancer

WASHINGTON — A mutated gene that causes an inherited colon cancer may play a key role in other forms of the killer disease has been isolated by researchers.

The discovery may lead to screening tests in families where colon cancer is common and the development of drugs to treat the disease, the researchers said.

In separate studies to be out today, researchers at Johns Hopkins University Medical School and the University of Utah report they have found a gene is mutated or missing in patients with familial adenomatous polyposis coli, a condition that nearly always leads to colon cancer at an early age.

Ken Kinzler of the Hopkins team said the studies strongly suggest that the gene, dubbed APC, must be flawed or missing to start development of most colon cancers. That means that finding a drug to compensate for the mutated, non-working gene may prevent or cure colon cancer, he said.

"The hope is that if we understand how this thing (mutated gene) works, then we can take an intelligent approach in designing drugs to help defeat the cancer," Kinzler said in an interview. "If you don't know what's broken, you can't fix it."

Cancer of the colon and rectum is the second leading form of lethal cancer, annually killing about 60,000 Americans. Only lung cancer is more lethal.

Death risk increases with use of drug

NEW YORK — A study has found that excessive use of the widely prescribed anti-asthma drug may increase the risk of a fatal asthma attack. The New York Times reported Thursday.

Officials of the United States subsidiary of Boehringer Ingelheim GMBH of Germany, which manufactures the drug and sponsored the study, told The Times that it recently had notified the U.S. Food and Drug Administration of its findings.

The pharmaceutical company identified the drug as Beta-2 agonists, which is often dispensed in inhalators.

Dry cleaning fees higher for women

CHICAGO — Are laundresses taking women to the cleaners? The Illinois Human Rights Department says yes. Dry cleaners routinely charge more to clean women's shirts than men's.

Dry cleaning industry officials say that's true, but there's a good reason: Women's blouses typically require more hand-cleaning than men's shirts.

The state now is trying to determine if there is sufficiently serious gender discrimination to warrant negotiating a formal price agreement with five Chicago cleaners that it recently studied, a spokesman for the Human Rights Department said Thursday.

Man arrested on sexual battery charge

JACKSON, Miss. — The man who led police to Jeffrey L. Dahmer's apartment was being held in a Milwaukee jail without bail today on a sexual battery warrant from Mississippi.

In November, a Lee County, Miss., grand jury had indicted Tracy Edwards for sexual battery involving a 14-year-old girl. Lee County Assistant District Attorney Rob Coleman said Wednesday.

Edwards escaped Dahmer's apartment the night of July 22 and flagged down a passing patrol car on the street. A pair of handcuffs hung from one of Edwards' wrists and he told police Dahmer had tried to kill him.

Soviet magazine source of MIA photo

WASHINGTON — Pentagon officials said Thursday that, for the fourth time, a photograph given to them as evidence of Americans missing in southeast Asia has been identified as actually coming from a Soviet magazine.

The story it illustrated in the September 1989 issue of "Soviet Military Review" had nothing to do with MIAs, but was about nationalist liberation movements in the Baltic states, said Pentagon spokesman Cmdr. Ned Lundquist.

More minority advances promised

WASHINGTON — Labor Secretary Lynn Martin promised Thursday to help American corporations shatter the "glass ceiling" that keeps minorities and women from advancing.

Martin pledged to use her position as a "bully pulpit ... to encourage every corporation to develop its own strategy" for promoting women and minorities.

The action came after a Labor Department review of nine Fortune 500 companies revealed widespread barriers to promotion.

Memorial honoring blacks proposed

WASHINGTON — Plans for a memorial honoring black Americans who fought with the Union Army in the Civil War were announced Thursday.

The memorials, with 70 granite slabs engraved with soldiers' names, will be built next to a subway station along the U Street Northwest corridor, center of the city's black social life and commerce until the 1968 riots that followed the death of Martin Luther King Jr.

U.S. sending supplies to flood survivors

WASHINGTON — The Air Force is transporting 150,000 pounds of blankets and medical supplies to aid survivors of the floods that have struck central and eastern China, the Pentagon announced Thursday.

A C-5 transport plane from Travis Air Force Base, Calif., will deliver 30 air cargo pallets of blankets donated by private organizations and two pallets of medical supplies from excess Pentagon stocks to Shanghai, a statement said.

Iraq closer to nuclear bomb than thought

WASHINGTON (AP) — Iraq was a year or two away from producing enough nuclear fuel for a bomb, not five or 10 years as U.S. intelligence believed, administration officials say.

The officials were surprised this week by the discovery of another piece in Iraq's nuclear weapons puzzle — a plan to make centrifuges for uranium enrichment.

A team of international monitors found the plant during a surprise inspection of a government complex near Baghdad, an official said. The plant was to become operational by the end of this year, but the schedule was interrupted by the war with the U.S.-led allies, said the official, who spoke only on condition of anonymity.

The inspectors, on their fourth postwar U.N. mission to investigate Iraq's nuclear program, said the plant was supposed to produce roughly 200 centrifuges annually for uranium enrichment, he said.

The United States and its allies knew Iraq was buying components for a centrifuge process, and they had successfully confiscated some related shipments to Iraq. But they didn't know the Iraqis had an operational facility for centrifuge production, the officials said.

"They were clearly closer than we estimated," said the second official. "They were within a year or two of having a production line for the bomb."

USS Iowa report may not resolve questions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy said Thursday it will be several weeks before it releases a new report on the 1989 explosion on the USS Iowa that killed 47 sailors, a study sources say may not completely resolve the questions surrounding the blast.

In its initial investigation, the Navy concluded the explosion "most probably" was an intentional act by gunner's mate Clayton Hartwig, described as despondent over a failed relationship.

Navy officials, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said Thursday that scientists from the Sandia National Laboratories and Navy investigators have been unable to agree on several major points in a renewed technical investigation ordered last year by Navy Secretary H. Lawrence Garrett III.

The Navy accused Hartwig, who was killed in the blast, of placing "some type of detonation device" between gunpowder bags as he supervised the loading of the warship's 16-inch guns.

Garrett ordered the investigation reopened after the unexpected ignition of gunpowder occurred in suite tests ordered by Congress.

The New York Times reported Wednesday that information gleaned in Sandia's experiments suggest that a small number of gunpowder bags used as a propellant in the 16-inch guns are prone to ignition under extreme pressure.

The Times report said the data, however, offered no definitive cause for the Iowa blast.

Appeal filed in abortion case

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Louisiana's attorney general Thursday formally began the appeal process that he hopes will take the state's abortion law, the strictest in the nation, to the U.S. Supreme Court.

U.S. District Judge Adrian Duplantier reluctantly struck down the law Wednesday, declaring that the Supreme Court's 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision recognizing the right to an abortion is "still the law of this land."

Attorney General William Guste, an outspoken opponent of legal abortion, filed a formal notice of appeal with the federal district court here late this morning.

He said the record of the case will be transmitted to the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals — next door to the district court — by Friday. He added that he will try to persuade the Supreme Court to take jurisdiction in the case, bypassing the appeals court, and hear the matter when its new term begins in the fall.

"We are saying that this is of such importance because it deals with the saving of lives of unborn children," Guste said in an interview outside the federal courthouse.

Mobsters convicted of racketeering

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Eight New England mobsters were convicted of racketeering Thursday in a case federal prosecutors boasted would break the back of the Patriarca crime family.

The verdict came just as the jury began its 15th day of deliberations.

A sweeping federal indictment charged various defendants with gambling, loan-sharking and murder to support the activities of the Providence, R.I.-based Patriarca family. Authorities say the Mafia family has controlled the rackets in New England since the 1940s.

Former BCCI official details secretive management

WASHINGTON (AP) — A former chief financial officer of the Bank of Credit and Commerce International, saying he was writing public threats to his life, told Congress on Thursday that the bank's two top executives built "a lot of Chinese walls" to keep managers in the dark about illicit operations.

More than 20 people were involved in what you have been hearing about," Masihur Rahman, a former BCCI executive in London, testified to the Senate subcommittee on terrorism, narcotics and international operations.

BCCI, recently indicted by a New York grand jury, has been accused of massive fraud, laundering of drug profits, and international arms trafficking.

Rahman, a native of India who worked in the bank's London office, said he fled to United States because of threats against his life by a fellow BCCI executive and others after he spearheaded an internal investigation demanded by the bank's auditors in 1990.

"My wife and children were suffering greatly," said Rahman, who worked for BCCI from its founding in 1972 until mid-1990. "They were being terrorized by this situation."

Rahman said that when he told another BCCI executive in London, Mazhar Abbas, that he was considering speaking out publicly, Abbas became "furious" and told him: "I've personally killed people in my life ... and I'd use the same gun on you."

Rahman's American wife, Ellen, sat in back of him in the hearing room, fighting back tears as Rahman described how she put their children under the beds every night for fear they could be shot.

MIAMI (AP) — Postdated checks from top U.S. coffee roasters helped finance an alleged coffee-smuggling scheme linked to the scandal-plagued Bank of Credit and Commerce International, according to BCCI documents filed in a lawsuit.

The checks, from Chock Full O' Nuts Corp., Chase & Sanborn, and the now-inactive James W. Phye & Co., were dated a month or more in advance and made out to "Munster-Bilbesi," who is accused of smuggling.

Bilbesi, whose brother runs BCCI's branch in Jordan, used the checks as collateral with BCCI to buy Central American coffee for sale in Jordan or Syria in 1985, according to the documents.

Coffee roaster's check used in smuggling

SARASOTA, Fla. (AP) — The priorities of the sheriff's department have come under attack since the arrest of children's TV star Pee-wee Herman on an indecent exposure charge at an adult theater.

Defense lawyers, civil libertarians and newspaper editorials have echoed the question: Don't the police have anything better to do?

"What about the rapists, murderers and drug dealers?" asked Sarasota Circuit Public Defender Elliot Metcalfe. "The criminals are out there committing crimes while deputies are in the adult theater ... I don't think that's effective law enforcement."

Four Sarasota County sheriff's deputies were in the theater July 26 and observed Pee-wee Herman actor Paul Reubens allegedly masturbating twice in 10 minutes during nighttime showings of "Nancy Nurse" and "Turn Up The Heat."

Theater employees said as many as eight undercover vice and narcotics detectives have been in the theater for hours at a time.

"I don't have to explain why we do what we do," Sheriff Geoff Monge said in refusing requests from The Associated Press for an interview. "You folks are beating this to death."

Monge has said his undercover detectives' top priority is drug enforcement. Patrols of adult theaters and other vice slings are done only to fill the boredom between complex drug investigations, he has said.

For example, if a drug buy were set up for the evening and fell through, then the detectives would go to the adult movie theater, according to a sheriff's spokesman, Capt. Terry Lewis. He said 90 percent of detectives' time is spent on active drug investigations.

Said Monge: "Instead of having them sit around for the rest of the evening, that's when they go to the adult theaters."

Policing morality is nothing new to this slow-paced retirement community of 53,000 residents on Florida's southwest coast where white hair is as common a sight as the white sand beaches.

Five sunbathers wearing T-back bathing suits were arrested last year under a city ordinance that prohibited "exposure of the anal cleft."

Feds: Protect eagles, close park to boats

TWIN FALLS - Centennial Park should be closed to boaters in the winter to protect bald eagles, federal wildlife officials say.

And the Idaho Fish and Game Department wants boat speeds kept to 5 mph on the three-mile stretch of the Snake River park. Noise and wakes from faster speeds could harm birds that nest on or near the water, the agency says.

The Bureau of Land Management will look at these concerns, as well as a few raised by Jerome County officials, in its final report on the park, said BLM spokesman Scott Barker. But in its first study of the park plan, the agency did not see the project harming the canyon area.

"That's the general trend of it," Barker said.

The study, called an environmental assessment, is part of the process of leasing the BLM land to the county for the park. The BLM looked at five critical elements: air quality; cultural resources; flood plains; water quality; wetlands and riparian zones (areas along the river banks).

The park will affect none of these elements, the study says.

But that's where some disagreement starts.

Idaho Fish and Game workers say fast boats can damage banks and hurt waterfowl that nest on the river in riparian zones.

"We have serious concerns about drastic increases in human activity. We have reasonable concerns about high-speed boating and wave action on nests," said Fish and Game Region IV Director Carl

New IRS bill could give taxpayers more rights

Taxpayers would have more rights when dealing with the Internal Revenue Service if a bill introduced by Sen. Steve Symms last week becomes law.

Among other provisions, the "Fairplay for Taxpayers Act of 1991" would make communications between taxpayers and their tax advisors privileged; make it easier for taxpayers to sue the IRS for damages and defense costs; and prohibit new tax regulations from being applied retroactively.

Most IRS employees are hard-working, honest and fair-minded, Symms said in introducing the bill. However, he

added, "when something goes wrong, the power of the IRS is so enormous that a handful of uncaring or over-zealous individuals can make a taxpayer's life miserable and even destroy the taxpayer financially through no fault of his own."

Symms' bill is intended to extend and strengthen the Taxpayer Bill of Rights, passed in 1988. That law, among other things, strengthened the power of the IRS ombudsman to intercede with the agency on taxpayers' behalf and gave taxpayers the right to sue the IRS for civil damages.

While Symms supported the 1988 law, he felt it wasn't strong enough, said J.D. Foster, the tax expert in Symms' Washington office.

"By the time it became law, the bill had been watered down considerably," Foster said. "I'm not saying it wasn't a good or a needed law, but the name was almost stronger than the bill."

Symms' proposed bill would make many changes including:

- Making tax-related communications between a taxpayer and his attorney, accountant, or other tax preparer privileged. That means the IRS would not be able to force a taxpayer to turn over letters, notes and working papers related to that person's taxes, as it now can.

Most lawyers don't know their tax-related communications with clients are exempt from attorney-

City tries to sell center to build up funds

CASTLEFORD - The city's reserve and investment fund is still lower than it should be after paying for major repairs flude to the city's water system during the winter.

The city is required by the Farmers Home Administration to keep an additional \$20,000 for its water and sewer loans in its reserve and investment fund.

"The city has that," said City Clerk Patsy Kinyon, but only that.

City officials had planned to sell the city's community center building and use the proceeds to build up the reserve and investment fund as protection against major repairs that may occur in the future.

But so far the city has had no luck in selling the building.

In other business, the city's \$91,068 budget for the upcoming year is only \$1100 higher than last year's budget of \$89,926.

The City Council reviewed its proposed 1991-92 budget at this week's meeting.

A special budget hearing is set for 8 p.m. Sept. 3 at J & D Enterprises in Castleford. The public is invited to attend.

The city will begin enforcing its water ordinance soon, meaning that all water bills must be paid in full each month. Castleford city residents with past-due water bills must pay in full by Aug. 15.

Any overdue accounts not paid in full by mid-August will receive a notice giving them an additional 10 days to pay in full.

However, a service charge will be added to their account for being delinquent.

If the bill hasn't been paid by the end of the 10 days, the water will be turned off and will not be turned back on until the bill is paid.

And a \$10 turn-on fee, plus a \$30 deposit, then will be required before the water can be turned back on.

Also at the meeting, Fire Chief Dan DeBoer reported that the Castleford street dance held last month netted approximately \$2,400, with proceeds going to the volunteer fire department.

Grant, rate increase gives Bliss more spending funds

BLISS - An \$18,000 grant from the Idaho Department of Water Resources and a 67 percent increase in city water rates will give Bliss about \$26,000 more in city funds next year.

A proposed city budget, presented to the City Council Wednesday night, includes the grant and the rate increase in the \$43,983 city water fund.

The extra money has been put into a "pipe and pump expense" fund, to pay for

Environmental Protection Agency-mandated repairs to the city well and water system.

An additional \$200 also has been added to the "water sampling" fund after bacteria problems in city water earlier this month prompted a request by water quality officials for more frequent testing of the Bliss supply.

The proposed budget totals \$90,679, with \$12,000 slated to go toward street maintenance, \$1,000 to a park fund, and \$33,696 to the general fund for payroll, taxes, insurance, and a city audit, among other items.

Bliss will collect about \$20,000 in

property taxes for the 1992 fiscal year, and \$21,000 in service fees. Other money will come from a \$3,000 insurance levy, state revenue sharing, sales tax, and a \$3,000 carry over from 1991.

A public hearing on the budget will be held at 8 p.m. Sept. 4.

The Fern Cenerusa Memorial covered picnic area has been built at City Park. Cenerusa's family donated the materials for the structure in memory of the long-time Bliss City Council member. The structure was erected by Charles E. Wilkens, of Bliss.

Female sect members reported modeling, selling fashion lingerie

OGDEN, Utah (AP) — Some women and girls of a secretive religious sect carried part of their livelihoods manufacturing, modeling and selling "fantasy" lingerie, a newspaper has reported.

The lingerie business and other activities of the purported polygamist sect have been under increased scrutiny since the Friday police search of seven homes in the group's neighborhood, the Standard-Examiner said Thursday.

Nine children were taken into protective custody, as authorities pursued their child abuse investigation involving group members.

Arrest warrants were signed Tuesday for Arvin Shreeve, 61, believed to be the group's leader, on felony charges of aggravated sexual assault and sodomy involving two children younger than 14.

Police continued to look for Shreeve Thursday.

According to the newspaper, members of the so-called Sister Group sold lingerie and bodice costumes with titles such as "Roped

and Branded," "Wicked Witch" and "Pirate's Delight."

The lingerie was produced in the home of a group member and marketed locally under the brand name "Sweet Things," according to former group members, documents obtained by the Standard-Examiner and an interview with a private investigator who infiltrated the group last fall and recorded videotape and took photos at the group's lingerie shows.

The investigator told the Standard-Examiner that women, including a 14-year-old girl, modeled the items at private home shows, "as well as public events such as the 1990 Boutique Show in Ogden and the 1990 Total Woman Show in Salt Lake City.

Items were also sold to the public at a local beauty shop, through a local modeling agency and by mail order. Brochures assured women the lingerie would help "make your dreams come true" and help in "keeping the home fires burning BRIGHTLY!"

State and local records, however, indicate the group did business under a name that is

legally registered to Summit County corporation that has no connection with the group, and that the business may have been conducted in violation of Ogden's home occupations ordinance.

According to Ogden records, Sweet Things is licensed as doing business as a native for Consolidated Enterprises, a corporation registered with the state for miscellaneous business ventures.

But state Department of Commerce records show Sweet Things is registered to Country Rose Corp., a Coalgville firm that makes paper collars for little girls.

Country Rose president Marilyn Wilson-Hugh told the Standard-Examiner she had never heard of the Ogden lingerie operation or the group behind it. She also said the group was using the name illegally and without her permission.

Ogden ordinances limit home occupations to members of a single family who reside on the premises, and prohibit selling goods at the home.

One former group member and the private investigator said people attending the home

shows were given price lists and instructions for ordering lingerie.

They also said women not living in the home were involved in designing and manufacturing the lingerie items.

"Pirate's Delight," according to price lists, included a G-string panty, a head tie and an eye patch. "Roped and Branded" came with a bandana, a soft rope and wrist cuffs, while "Wicked Witch" offered a gown, a drape, a G-string and an anklet.

The former group member and the private investigator said the women and a teenager who modeled the lingerie would wear sheer body suits only on some occasions.

"They used sex a lot as a tool" to recruit new members, said Kori Christofferson, 23, who left the group in May and has played a key role in the Weber County attorney's investigation.

"If somebody wanted a home show and came out to the group and it was somebody they felt like they could work with, they wouldn't wear the body suits," said Christofferson, who was a narrator at several shows.

Cheryl Naugle, an Orem private investigator, said she was hired to infiltrate the group by a man whose 14-year-old daughter was involved in modeling youth lingerie items and who feared the girl was being exploited.

Naugle said she was told the group went into the lingerie business after an exotic dancer approached one of the women and asked her to sew some custom-made costumes.

She said at that point, group members decided there was a market for g-strings and bodice clothing.

"The first time that I went in, they mentioned the name of the girl Naugle said. "They also don't wear underwear they wear G-strings or their T-panties ... and they will pull their skirts up right in front of you."

Naugle videotaped one home show in which body suits were used, and took a number of still photographs when no suits were used.

Copies of the tape and photos were obtained by the Standard-Examiner.

Firefighters expect to quench stubborn fire today; lightning fire burns 9 acres

UINTAH, Utah (AP) — A stubborn brush fire scorched another 50 acres just inside northern Utah's Weber Canyon, but fire bosses got a break from the wind Thursday and encircled the blaze once again.

Meantime, a lightning-caused fire burned about nine acres in the Kolob Canyon area of Zion National Park in southwestern Utah.

And firefighters in Salt Lake City said they had brought a brush fire in an industrial sector under control.

Fire officials had expected to control the Broad Hollow blaze by Wednesday evening, but a breakthrough required a new fire line to be built.

About 40 firefighters aided by two helicopters were on the mountain Thursday, said Pete Hansen of the Interagency Fire Center.

"It's not as windy today, so

they're doing real good," he said. "They got a line around it, but there's quite a few pockets of unburned fuel in the middle."

He said if the crews could hold their own through Thursday's burning period, they should be able to contain the fire by Friday morning and achieve control later in the day.

The fire was ignited Monday by a Union Pacific freight train.

Although four fires were kindled, two were extinguished early and the other two merged to form the main fire.

The blaze temporarily knocked out outside telephone service to about 10,000 customers in Morgan Valley.

Service was completely restored by Wednesday morning.

One firefighter was injured but there was no damage to structures.

The fire in the northwest corner of Zion's National Park fire was

contained Wednesday evening and control was expected Friday, said National Park Service dispatcher Cam Lee Nuss.

The fire was burning in a mixture of ponderosa pine, mahogany and brush, she said.

A 20-person interagency "Alpine Hotshot" crew was on the scene along with park personnel.

Nuss said a helicopter and an air tanker were dumping water on the blaze.

The fire in southwest Salt Lake City burned 12 acres of brush and threatened a propane tank and warehouses before firefighters brought it under control, said Battalion Chief Rensald Egbert of the Salt Lake City Fire Department.

A train threw off sparks that ignited the blaze at 5:30 p.m.

But by Thursday night only 10 of the 40 firefighters originally called out were still on the scene, he said.

Kern River denied permission to make trail into access road

BOUNTIFUL, Utah (AP) — The company building an interstate natural gas pipeline has had a state permit suspended and will not be allowed to turn a popular hiking trail in Mueller Park into an access road.

The state engineering office said Thursday it will notify Kern River Gas Transmission Co. that it is temporarily suspending a stream-alteration permit because it failed to meet certain qualifications.

Mike Kealey, assistant attorney general, said Kern River did not follow certain environmental requirements when working through some of the nearly 80 streams it is crossing in the state.

"The permit will be temporarily suspended until they come into compliance," he said.

Kealey said none of the alleged "violations are a threat to public safety."

Meanwhile, Salt Lake District Ranger Mike Sieg said the U.S.

Forest Service is denying the proposed access road through Kenny Creek Trail because it would cause permanent damage.

"We are saying no because once that road is put in there, it will always be a road," he said.

"In order to cut the road, in some places we'd have to cut at angles of 15 feet and there is no way that can be rehabilitated."

In a letter to Kern River, Sieg said it was "clear that our objective of ending up with a better trail than what we have now cannot be met by constructing a temporary road, based on the amount of vegetation clearing that would be required, we would lose the 'trail corridor' feel for several decades."

Kern River spokesman Dan Lewis said Wednesday his company is not working to alter alternate construction plan that will comply with the Forest Service's concerns.

Kern River couldn't be reached for comment regarding the state permit suspension Thursday.

"It is too early to say if this will put us behind schedule," Lewis said Wednesday.

News of the Forest Service denial made headlines in Bountiful. His Residents and Concerned Citizens Association members, who have been opposing the pipeline, hopped but cautious.

"I'm really happy Kenny Creek Trail won't be turned into a temporary road, but I am concerned we will just make an access road to another area," said spokesman Dave Souter.

Souter said the Forest Service did the right thing.

"They didn't make a lot of friends in allowing the pipeline to be in the first place, but at least they are keeping their promise to make Kern River comply with environmental regulations," he said.

More strict speed controls are in place on boats, a plan to monitor the effects of waves should be drawn up, he said.

"There should be some possibility of reviewing the impacts," he said.

BLM wildlife experts also think wave damage the river banks or hurt birds, Barker said. But Barker, who led the team that made the study, is not sure how much damage the waves would create.

A strong storm creates as much wave action as motorboats, but those do not hurt the banks, Barker said.

"I question the significance of it," he said.

If the waves do harm the banks or birds, the BLM can look at the

impact again in two years, he said.

Barker did not know whether the BLM would officially suggest that the park should be closed to boating from November through March. But it might, he said.

BLM biologist Paul Makela wrote at the end of the environmental study that: "The proposed action will occur in an area used by wintering bald eagles. Major recreational use and construction activities must be limited to the months of April through October."

This idea actually came from U.S. Fish and Wildlife workers, and the BLM put it into writing, Barker said.

The comment period on the study ended Thursday, Barker will write a final assessment within the next week, which must be OK'd by the BLM area manager.

Comments from the public and government agencies will be considered in writing the final assessment, Barker said. About a dozen people commented on the study.

A public notice that the agency plans to lease the county 20 acres for the park will be placed in the media, soon. The public will have 45 days to comment on the notice. If no one protests, the lease could be issued 15 days after the comment period ends, Barker said.

The county can do work on the BLM land until a lease is issued, he said. A power site classification on the land, which stopped the county from getting a lease, has been removed by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, Barker said.

client privilege. Foster said, "I've had great fun watching their eyeballs go up when I tell them they don't have any privilege."

Allowing taxpayers to recover part of the costs and fees incurred as part of an IRS proceeding if they prevail to some extent in the controversy.

For example, if the amount the IRS claimed a taxpayer owed eventually was reduced by 40 percent, that person would be able to recover 40 percent of the costs he or she incurred in the action.

Allowing taxpayers to sue for civil damages if an IRS agent is careless either in collecting tax or determining tax liability.

The Taxpayer Bill of Rights allows taxpayers to sue only if an IRS employee recklessly disregards the law or agency procedures in collecting tax.

Applying all new tax regulations from the date they were issued, rather than the date the law under which the regulations were written was passed.

The current system, under which new regulations are effective retroactively, is unfair, Symms said.

Equalizing the interest rates the government charges on back taxes or penalties and the rate it pays on money it owes taxpayers. Editorial Landfill progress continues; procrastination won't help

Subtitle D, the long-pending set of federal solid waste regulations that has been hanging over Magic Valley counties like a sword for two years, turns out to be not quite as fearsome as advertised.

The federal Office of Management and Budget has told the Environmental Protection Agency that the landfill regulations are unnecessarily harsh.

The decision effectively gives Magic Valley counties — and the rest of Idaho — a reprieve from the ruinously expensive business of building new landfills.

Officially, the rules have been delayed, but in effect they'll probably be watered down.

That may mean, for example, that local government will only have to install one landfill liner instead of two.

Magic Valley counties, already far along in the process of planning for multiple landfills, will get some breathing space. We hope they'll use the time to refine their plans, not procrastinate.

That's a real concern, since county officials have only reluctantly agreed to cooperate under the gun to form a solid-waste plan.

They're going to have a powerful tendency now to put off expensive, and politically difficult, decisions and go back to the old notion of a piecemeal solution to the valley's solid waste problems.

That would be a mistake. Not even intramural squabbling within the federal bureaucracy alters the fact

that, collectively or individually, all eight counties are going to have to build environmentally safe landfills.

And it doesn't mean the dozen existing landfills in the valley that don't meet federal standards won't have to be cleaned up.

Back when the specter of Subtitle D was still bearing down on them, the conventional wisdom among Magic Valley county officials was that there should be three regional landfills. But with the benefit of breathing space, maybe it now makes more sense to build one.

It also may be prudent to contract the whole operation to a private company, assuming the counties are willing to maintain close scrutiny over cost and make sure environmental standards are met.

The danger is that the fiercely independent Magic Valley counties might still be mulling their options six months or a year from now when the EPA comes knocking on the door — demanding action and imposing a timetable for achieving it.

When Subtitle D first reared its head two years ago, it seemed inconceivable that Magic Valley county commissioners could cooperate long enough to actually get a regional solid waste plan in place. They've done that and more.

They have come so far that they're on the verge of putting in place a plan that will meet tough federal environmental standards and setting up a system to pay for it.

That's real progress. Let's not blow it now.



Right wing derails another sex study

What percentage of sexually active teen-agers use condoms?

Don't ask. How many adolescent boys have gotten a girl pregnant?

Don't ask. What kind of parental tactics succeed in postponing sexual activity by their children?

Don't ask.

U.S. teen-agers are not more promiscuous than adolescents in other countries — just a lot more likely to get pregnant. American puritans apparently is strong enough to keep teen-agers from using think-ahead methods of birth control, but not strong enough to keep them from having sex. Why did Health and Human Services Secretary Louis Sullivan cancel a five-year study on teen-age sexuality and drug and alcohol use last week?

Because asking kids who are having sex about sex might encourage them to have sex.

The official statement said Sullivan was "concerned by the possible inadvertent message this survey could send that would distract from the potential scientific benefits and be counterproductive to his commitment to better communicate the message against casual sex."

The real reason is that some right-wing heavies are vehemently opposed to funding surveys of sexual behavior. Two years ago, they got Congress to block an \$11 million survey of adult sexual behavior by the Public Health Service, which might have been enormously useful in figuring out how to stop the spread of AIDS.

Now, the politicians have blocked scientists' attempt to get data on teen-agers that might be more reliable than "everybody's doing it."

The American Teen-age Study was sponsored by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, University of North Carolina researchers were to ask 24,000 seventh- through 11th-grade students

sexually active adolescents were to be asked questions about sexual behavior. For all the talk of "secondary virginity" (renouncing premarital sex after you've tried it), there is no secondary innocence.

Teens who said they'd never held hands or kissed in early questions were not going to be asked about oral and anal sex, or Peewee Herman's sexual preference.

Opponents of sex education often argue that the best protection of celibacy is youthful innocence. Once kids start talking frankly about sexual feelings and body parts, they believe, there's no barrier of modesty to prevent adolescents from expressing those feelings.

There would be something to this if teen-agers were shielded from sexual knowledge. But how many seventh through 11th graders have never seen Madonna's underwear parts, they believe, there's no barrier of modesty to prevent adolescents from expressing those feelings.

Why is the right wing so opposed to trying to find out the answers to these questions? Rep. William Dannemeyer, R-Calif., said the study promoted the "homosexual political agenda," complaining of "disgusting" questions on oral and anal sex.

Is he afraid that more people will have done these "disgusting" things than it is politically convenient? Surely, he's not opposed to understanding sexual behavior because it could help end the spread of AIDS, thereby allowing some gay males to survive.

As for Dannemeyer's warning of "bureaucratic intrusion," it sounds a bit odd from someone normally so eager to intrude in the private lives of others.

I'll admit that "UNCLE SAM WANTS YOU to talk about your sex life" sounds kinky. But this wasn't the census. Nobody would have been obliged to answer anything. Just say no to nosy researchers. The UNC team had planned to require written parental consent for teen-agers to participate in the study, and also planned to question one parent of each teen-age participant.

The study was designed so that only

Use Idaho lands to benefit state

In reference to recent comments to questions you publication asked regarding grazing fees, We, the Gooding County Farm Bureau Women's Committee, would like to touch on a few points in this ongoing discussion.

When first looking at the amount currently charged per animal unit month (\$1.97 for grazing public land vs. private grazing (\$10 to \$12), it appears the public grazing formula is much too low. However, when the question is researched, the picture changes dramatically.

The first consideration is the cost to the rancher of the permit which he has purchased for \$50 to \$100 per animal unit month. Add to this all the other costs involved — interest on the permit, water system costs (wells and pipelines in many cases), along with maintenance of the water system), fencing materials and labor to build and maintain, rider fees to control where livestock are grazed and poison plant control, which can be a very large item in many cases. When grazing private land, all of the above costs are borne by the landowner.

We know of one rancher at Fairfield running 500 cows who lost 52 head to poison plants in one season alone. In addition to grazing costs, there is the matter of generating dollars to pay local taxes for schools, roads, local government, etc. If the livestock is forced off the public lands, part of the taxes these ranches are not paying will have to be picked up and paid for by other home and land owners.

One other point that should be brought out is that if livestock is removed from the public lands, the chances of fire will be greatly increased and will be very costly to control.

Whether you are a professional person, a business person or blue collar worker, your income depends to a very great degree on agriculture dollars. According to a recent University of Idaho study on the total dollar impact of agriculture in the Magic Valley is 80 percent.

There are many other points that could be considered that time and space will not allow; but we feel that with the more than two-thirds of Idaho publicly owned land, it must be used to benefit our state economy and tax base.

The girl left Steven in the tub and left the room. Another child turned water into the tub. The child's mother said she was doing dishes in the kitchen and didn't hear the child turn on the water.

Boy dies in rock climbing accident

STANLEY — A 13-year-old boy has fallen to his death while rock climbing near Stanley campgrounds.

The boy, whose identity has not been released, was hiking with his uncle Wednesday night when he slipped on loose rocks and fell off a ridge, the Custer County sheriff's office said.

Man sentenced for rape of ex-wife

IDAHO FALLS — An Idaho Falls man has been ordered to spend 12 years to life in prison for kidnapping and raping his ex-wife in January.

The man's former wife alleged he used a stun gun on her in a kidnapping that went to Las Vegas and back to Idaho.

Seventh District Judge Marvin Smith sentenced Michael Whiteley, 41, to 20 years on the rape conviction and life on the kidnapping charge, with a minimum of 12 years. The sentences will run at the same time.

Whiteley's attorney, Stevan Thompson, questioned the woman's credibility and urged leniency. Whiteley also disputed his wife's story in a lengthy statement to the judge.

Cleanup plans called unnecessary

IDAHO FALLS — The Energy Department's plans to spend millions of dollars to clean up radioactive and hazardous wastes at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory are being criticized as unnecessary as hearings on the cleanup proposal get under way in eastern Idaho.

The sessions continued Thursday night in Pocatello after opening a day earlier in Idaho Falls, where the value of the department's plan to clean up a contaminated waste water pond and an underground pocket of contaminated water were questioned.

Retired INEL health physicist John Horan called the plan a "political fraud and a technical hoax. Efforts are being made to bluff us into buying a gold-plated project."

Court rejects panel's recommendation

BOISE — The Idaho Supreme Court says the level of proof that a Pocatello lawyer violated professional ethics did not reach the standard required, and it has rejected a recommendation that he be suspended from law practice for six months.

The court on Wednesday in an unsigned opinion turned down a recommendation of the Board of Professional Conduct of the Idaho State Bar for disciplinary action against Gordon W. Jenkins.

Court records said disciplinary proceedings were started when the Bar received complaints that a legal assistant employed by the Jenkins law firm solicited business from the family of a man killed in a traffic accident, and a woman injured in an accident. Both alleged incidents occurred in 1986.

Report supports mother's fight for custody

MOSCOW (AP) — Despite contrary recommendations from his own staff, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare continues to keep a Moscow woman's two children in a Kamiah foster home.

The mother, LeeAnn Franks, Wednesday said a scheduled court hearing at Orofino before Magistrate Ralph Haley failed, she said Tuesday.

"Ms. Franks' two children, a daughter, 14, and a son, 11, were placed under foster care earlier this year on allegations their mother, an advocate of home schooling, had refused to properly educate them."

"The department, however, has apparently done a turnaround and now recommends the three be reunited, according to records."

Haley and other officials have refused to comment on the case, saying they are prohibited under the Idaho Child Protective Act.

But Ms. Franks gave a reporter documents, including a July 23 progress report from Lynn Call, Health and Welfare's family and children's services supervisor, at Orofino. Ms. Call recommends "that the children be immediately returned to LeeAnn."

Ms. Franks also has a copy of an Aug. 1 letter from a senior social worker written to her attorney.

"Both children want to return home but are afraid to hope as they feel they have no control over anything at this point," the social worker wrote. "So far, I have not encountered any problems in working with

LeeAnn and she is very appropriate when she is with her children. I leave her with them for hours at a time and I do not see any inappropriate behaviors from the children at the end of these visits."

Ms. Franks said she spent the entire day alone with her children Tuesday after the hearing was postponed. The children were then returned to a foster home at Kamiah.

Haley put Ms. Franks in jail for 45 days last November when she refused to tell him where her children were. When a friend finally notified Health and Welfare officials about the children's whereabouts, Ms. Franks was released from the Clearwater County jail, but has been separated from them ever since.

She said there is still talk among some in the case to have her parental rights terminated.

Ms. Franks was home schooling her children at Weippe in Clearwater County when Robert Donohue, superintendent of the Orofino school district, refused to accept her proposed curriculum.

After several court hearings, Haley ruled the children's education was being neglected and ordered them into foster care. That is when Ms. Franks refused to disclose their location.

She said Wednesday she believes God had "foreknowledge" of what has transpired so far and that higher authority will eventually set the matter straight.

Heavy-metal pollution poses health threat

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Heavy-metal pollution in the Coeur d'Alene River and several nearby lakes could pose a health threat to campers, anglers and swimmers, a new federal study shows.

The accumulation of metals comes from "an century of mining runoff from northern Idaho's Silver Valley."

The study released Wednesday recommends the Bureau of Land Management post signs in the area warning people to reduce their exposure to the water and soil. It also suggests limiting consumption of fish and waterfowl from the area.

"People coming in contact with those soils and sediments frequently may have adverse health effects," said Steve Hanes, the environmental health scientist who prepared the report.

Lead and other heavy metals can cause neurological disorders.

Children who gulp lead-laden sediment while swimming are especially susceptible to lead poisoning, which can hinder intellectual development and cause hearing loss, Hanes said.

The Coeur d'Alene Indian Tribe has sued nine companies to try to expand a federally ordered cleanup of the Bunker Hill site at Kellogg in the Silver Valley to include the entire Coeur d'Alene River Basin.

Deputy points to colleagues

OSBURN (AP) — Fired Shoshone County sheriff's deputy Ernie Peyer of Osburn has implicated two other deputies in an alleged theft that apparently led to his dismissal last month.

The Coeur d'Alene Press has obtained a document written by Peyer describing how he witnessed one current deputy, and another who has quit the department, take police records from the sheriff's office in Wallace.

It says former deputy John Maucotel called Peyer and asked him to remove the records from the "Idaho State Police-deputy room" and take them to Maucotel's house.

The document says Peyer described to another deputy, who said he planned to take the papers, to Maucotel even at the risk of being fired, carried a box of daily police logs from the room, it says.

Maucotel declined comment Wednesday.

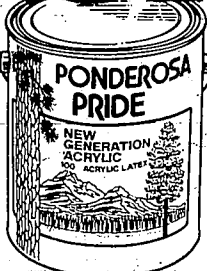

Gillespie heads to Sun Valley for festival

SUN VALLEY — "Live the Future: An Evening with Dizzy Gillespie and Miriam Makeba," a highlight to the Sun Valley Music Festival, is set for at 6:30 p.m. Saturday at the Trail-Creek Cabin grounds. Gates open at 5 p.m.

The legendary jazz trumpeter, Gillespie, will perform with South African, Makeba. Gillespie will bring with him members of his United Nations Orchestra.

Makeba, whose lyrical use of her native South Africa rhythms made such an impact on Paul Simon's Graceland album tour, will be bringing her own musicians; backup vocalists and dancers with her.

Tickets are general admission, \$20/\$15 for center members; children 12 and under, \$5/\$4 for center members, and are available at the Sun Valley Center Gallery, Chapter One Bookstore and Magic Mountain Music, all in Ketchum, the Ex Libris Bookstore in Sun Valley, and The Sound Socket in Hailey.

As virtuoso trumpeter, sax singer, composer and originator of the Charlie Parker and Thelonious Monk of bebop, John Birks "Dizzy" Gillespie's career has spanned five decades with no sign of diminishing.

Gillespie was the youngest of nine children and raised in South Carolina. He took up the trombone and the trumpet at the age of 12. It was at the age of 18 while touring with Frank Fairfax's Philadelphia band that he acquired the nickname, Dizzy, according to publicity information provided by the Sun Valley Center for the Arts and Humanities.

He first went to Europe in 1937 and on his return joined Cab Calloway's band. By 1945, he had made the first bebop recording with Coleman Hawkins having discovered

Concerts take to the open air as Elkhorn begins

SUN VALLEY — In what has become a tradition and an excellent way to spend hot August evenings, the Elkhorn Music Festival begins its seventh season of free outdoor concerts Saturday.

The festival features 12 open-air concerts at 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Aug. 10 to Aug. 25 in the tent on the Elkhorn Resort's Village Plaza.

Celebrating the bicentennial of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, who has been generally accepted as the world's greatest musical genius, the festival features seven evenings dedicated to Mozart's overtures, symphonies, concertos and vocal music.

"I'm particularly excited about the area where we'll have the most people involved and that's the choral concert," Eberl says.

"That's a particular source of gratification for me — having half the state involved, it's great and gives me a lot of pleasure and feeling of accomplishment."

In addition, the high number and caliber of soloists performing is unusual, as is a special evening with the musical family of Dr. Thom Ritter George.

George is a nationally known composer who has written a new piece for the festival entitled, "Westward Journey."

As guest conductor on Aug. 16, George will be joined by family soloists: his wife, flutist Patricia George; his daughter, Clara George singing a soprano aria; and his other daughter, violinist Samantha George.

On Aug. 18, pianist Mark Newirth, formerly of Kimberly and now living in Idaho Falls, will perform two Mozart piano concertos, a feat virtually unheard of for such a performance, Eberl says. Newirth will play Mozart's Piano Concert No. 9 in E Flat and an especially difficult concerto by Shostakovich.

The 34 musicians and their families began arriving in Sun Valley earlier this

He admits, even in his fatigue from his national tour to promote "Doc Hollywood," that he is one lucky fellow.

"I came to Hollywood at just the right time," the 30-year-old actor says. "I'm short, of course, and I don't have the conventional movie-star looks. But all the guys who were making over in the movie industry when I started — Steven Spielberg, Bob Zemeckis, Brian De Palma — these are who I call the 'chess club guys.' In high school, they were not the jocks and the guys voted most likely to succeed. They would have been the members of the chess club, just like I was. I was by no means the most popular guy in high school."

Luck also played a part in his portrayal of the time-traveling Marty McFly in the "Back to the Future" series. Eric Stoltz, the internalized actor best known for "Mink," "Some Kind of Wonderful" and "Memphis Belle," had been cast. After six weeks of filming, producer Spielberg and director Zemeckis decided to replace him with the more energetic Fox.

"One thing I always, always understood, was the utilitarian nature of that role," Fox says. "Marty McFly is basically just a tour-

guide in the "Back to the Future" movies. There's no room for introspection in that part. It calls for acting shorthand, which I understand. Bob (Zemeckis) would say, 'Okay, give me The Look of Surprise, Variation 3BX211.' And I would come up with The Look of Surprise, Variation 3BX211."

"This sounds like a very easy thing for me to say, but it all worked out fine for everyone. Eric has gone on to have a very respected career. "We don't own one big house. We have a series of small homes. We have our house in California, a house in Connecticut and a house in Vermont. I was only in Los Angeles to shoot interiors for 'Doc Hollywood' and 'The Hard Way.' So the idea in 'Doc Hollywood' of getting away from the city and leading a rural life really appealed to

Networks use sponsors to face down boycotts

NEW YORK — ABC, CBS and NBC, at times bedeviled by calls for boycotts against sponsors of their shows, are urging advertisers not to give in to such threats and not to shun controversial programs.

But one viewer, Vicki Riley, head of a small activist group, Concerned Viewers for Quality Television, in Wilmington, Del., is proposing what would be the mother of all TV boycotts — a national 24-hour tune-out next season.

She's urging viewers to mark Tuesday, Oct. 29, in their calendars for a national "Turn Off TV Day" to protest what she considers excessive sex and violence, and programs that she feels go against traditional moral values.

Peter Chrisanthopoulos, president of the Network Television Association, said the call for a national day of TV darkness "has nothing to do" with his group's three-page appeal to advertisers, issued earlier this week.

The NTA was founded last year by CBS, ABC and NBC to help state their case to advertisers, Congress and the public.

The epistle has been in the works three months, and was sent after NTA board meetings and talks with Jeff Sagansky, Robert Iger and Warren Littlefield, the programming chiefs of CBS, ABC and NBC, respectively, he said.

The issue of boycott threats and advertiser "hit lists" — programs that sponsors avoid because of possible controversy — "has never been addressed head-on by the networks in this type of format," he said.

The letter says the networks "vigorously support" freedom of expression. But it asserts that "boycotts and so-

called advertiser 'hit lists' are attempts to manipulate our free society and democratic process."

The networks, it says, "employ the strictest standards of all electronic media" for program content, "stricter than other over-the-air broadcasters and stricter than cable networks."

It also cites research that it says supports its contention that "the vast majority of Americans find network programming to be widely acceptable."

"I am delighted this letter has gone out — I think it shows we are indeed having some effect," says the Rev. Donald Wildmon, a Tupelo, Miss., minister who has been assailing the networks over program content since the days of Archie Bunker.

Riley said her protest is aimed at all television, not just the networks, and has been endorsed by several other activist groups. Her own group has between 800 and 1,000 members, she says.

"It should be stressed that television still is capable of having a lot of good quality to it," she said. "We don't feel the system is evil, and that people shouldn't watch it. It's just that it should act in a more socially responsible manner because it is so influential."

Wildmon, president of the American Family Association, periodically calls for sponsor boycotts.

He says his group has endorsed Riley's campaign, although he considers it more of a symbolic gesture than anything else.

Riley's campaign "is a good gesture, but I don't think it's a long-term solution," Wildmon said. "The long-term solution is economic boycotts of the companies that sponsor trash on television."

Bid bye bye to sig bylines

—NEW YORK (AP) — Variety Signs End Gig.

Another show business tradition is gone. Variety, the 86-year-old entertainment weekly, has ended its policy of abbreviating its critics' names, called "sigs," and started publishing their full bylines.

Until this week, Variety's New York theater critic was Remy, instead of Jeremy Gerard, its London theater critic, Jack Pflaum, went by Pit. Los Angeles film reviewer Brian Lowry was Bril. Television watcher David Bushman was Bush. Music critic Kevin Zimmerman was Kezi.

"Times have changed and so must Variety," editor Peter Bart wrote in the Aug. 5 issue of the show-business bible.

"Longtime Variety readers ... felt like members of an elite club. The present-day Variety, with a third of its readers overseas, has perhaps lost that 'clubbiness' but gained a clarity demanded by its sophisticated readership. And now even its critics have come out of hiding," Bart said in an editorial. The origin of Variety's odd abbreviations is unclear, Bart wrote, but they began appearing in 1905, the first year the weekly was published.

NTA's letter suggests that sponsor boycotts don't work. That notion is seconded by Beverly Flyer, spokeswoman for the American Association of Advertising Agencies, which says it represents 725 members nationally.

"We've been very aware" of calls for boycotts, she said. "But the feedback we've gotten is that they've not been very successful."

The major issue in all this "is that the networks want to put on programming that reflects society, that's thought-provoking, that's entertaining and pushes a few buttons," Chrisanthopoulos said.

"If we eliminate all those elements, the entire prime time schedule will be identical and entirely bland, and turn viewers away. And that's the issue. We don't want to kill the goose that laid the golden egg."

At first, though, the script did not. "It was offered to me three years ago," Fox says. "I just didn't like the way the story was handled. So I kept on not saying yes, but not really saying no. You can only keep that up for so long, and, fortunately, Michael Caton-Jones (the Scottish director of "Scandal" and "Memphis Belle") came along, and we saw the film the same way. He has a real reverence for Frank Capra and Preston Sturges, and he talked about the film within that context. So you have a film about the South directed by a Scot and starring a Canadian."

Fox, a below-average student who lived in a suburb of Vancouver, "just sort of fell into acting."

"I was 15, playing in bands," he says. "I thought of myself more as a musician than an actor. Then, as an extension of that, I started going out for auditions for television shows and theater. I started acting before I really realized that acting was what I wanted to do."

He explains his job to his son Sam terms—any 2-year-old can understand.

"He knows that Tracy and I are on television, but he's at the age where he thinks that everyone's parents do what his parents do," Fox says. "When he asks for specifics, I just tell him that I pretend for a living. He understands that perfectly."

Paul Shrader, the somber director of "Light of Day," in which Fox starred unsuccessfully with Joan Jet, says, not unkindly, that Fox has a great desire to be liked.

"That probably was true six years ago, when I made that film with Paul," Fox says. "Now I have more of a desire to like, as opposed to being liked. I am perfectly able to burn

bridges when they need to be burned, but I want to look for the best in situations. Because, after all, I'm going to be dead for a long, long time."



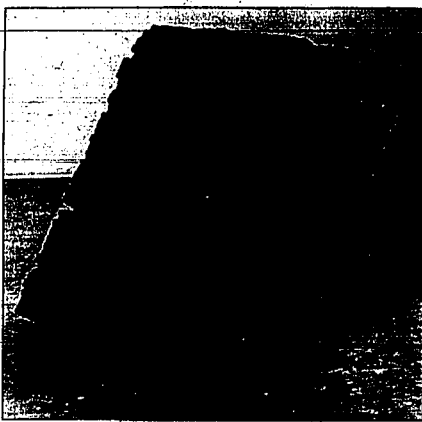

Now it's 'WKRP' - the next generation

LOS ANGELES - "WKRP in Cincinnati" is trying to become the "Star Trek" of comedy.

Like "Star Trek," "WKRP" was probably concocted before its time. Both shows proved to be wildly popular in syndication, and local stations would eagerly buy more episodes if they were available.

Paramount studios decided to make "Star Trek: The Next Generation," which has proven to be a hit on the so-called first-run syndication charts, the Nielsen ratings for new shows that are sold directly to local stations without running on a network first.

And Paramount has more episodes of the new "Star Trek" to sell in syndication than of the old one.

Now, MTM studios has decided to make "WKRP in Cincinnati" again. Production began last week on this year's planned 25 episodes, which will hit the air next month. The idea, which originated with Kevin Tanchell, head of MTM's television distribution, is to make 90 episodes during the next four years, doubling the number that MTM has to sell in syndication.

Reviving any show is tricky, but those behind "WKRP" seem to be going about it in the right way.

Three members of the original cast - Frank Bonner as sleazy salesman Herb Tarver, Gordon Jump as inept owner Arthur Carlson and Richard Sanders as nerdy newsman Les Nessman - are returning for the show.

The first two episodes - a two-parter that will update viewers on what has happened to the station during the nine years since we last visited - feature guest shots by two other familiar faces, Loni Anderson as receptionist Jennifer Marlowe and Howard Hesseman as disc jockey Johnny Fever. Most other members of the original cast have expressed interest in guest appearances.

Behind the scenes seems solid, too. The executive producer is Bill

Dial, who was on the original writing staff. Max Tash, who was also with "WKRP" all four years it was on the air, is a key writer and director.

And when production began last week, Hugh Wilson, the show's creator, was assumed to observe run-throughs and rehearsals, to give advice certainly, but perhaps more importantly, to give his blessing to the revival.

Didn't thought of it until I sat down for the first read-through with the cast," Dial said. "I produced Hugh to them and said he created this series 14 years ago. It was that long ago but people are still interested."

The changes in the series seem to be a logical updating of a radio station almost a decade later. The characters who have stayed are those who have roots in the community while those who have left, were radio Gypsies, the type who regularly travel from job to job.

With the rise in importance of morning radio, "WKRP" will focus on the station's morning drive team,

a husband and wife who are lovey-dovey on the air, but near divorce when the microphone is off. Kathleen Garrett and Michael Des Barres play them.

Tawny Kitaen is going to take over as the sex object from Anderson. She plays late-night D.J. Mona Loveland.

Jennifer's voice of competence will come from traffic manager Claire Hartline, played by Hope Alexander-Williams. Mykelti Williamson, a regular on "Midnight Caller," is the new program director. Donovan Aderhold. And character Arthur Carlson Jr. has grown up and is now inflicting himself on the station. Lightfield Lewis plays that part.

"The sets, many made from the original plans, are visually identical to those in old episodes of the series, again with a bit of modification and updating appropriate for the time that has passed. There's still masking tape on the floor around Nessman's desk, marking out his nonexistent office."

MTM is making the new

"WKRP" episodes on about 80 percent of the budget of a network sitcom. Trims have been made here and there, but not on the writing staff.

"The Writer's Guild contract allows first-run syndication to pay less money," Dial said.

"But we're paying network prices because we want to attract top writers."

When CBS canceled "WKRP" in 1982, it went virtually unnoticed because the demise of "Lou Grant" and its controversial star Ed Asner attracted most of the media attention.

But "WKRP" was the show, CBS researchers agree, that had more life left in it. It ran in 11 time slots during its four years.

If CBS had left it on Monday evenings, after "MASH," the network would have had a major hit on its hands. Instead, it kept moving the show around, trying to make it lead off an evening, or an hour, but was never able to find the right match for the other half hour.

'Women' script in doubt Nickelodeon breaks into toons

Saying she is "not stupid enough to be vindictive," "Designing Women" producer Linda Bloodworth-Thomson vowed earlier this week to reconsider a season-opening script replete with jabs at Suzanne Sugarbaker, the character played by Delta Burke, who left the show after a power struggle with the producers.

A handful of TV critics who attended the filming of the episode last week in Hollywood came away with the impression that Bloodworth-Thomson, who wrote the script, was trying to pour salt on Burke's wound. (The episode will air in September on CBS.)

Speaking from her office in Hollywood, Bloodworth-Thomson said that she was stunned by the suggestion and that cast members, who had read reports critical of the show, were visibly upset when they arrived at the studio.

"Meshach was in tears," she said, referring to Meshach Taylor, who plays Anthony on the show and was thought to be Burke's closest friend among the cast members at the end of last season.

"The cast, Harry (Thomason, co-producer) and I and all the producers thought it was a wonderful script," Bloodworth-Thomson said. "But maybe it's better to go back and take a second look. As President Bush would say, we want to avoid even the appearance of improp-

riety." She said a personal vendetta against Burke was the furthest thing from her mind as she wrote the script for the season-opener.

"I'm too tired to conjure up a plot like that," Bloodworth-Thomson said. "We consider it (the feud) over."

As for the plethora of Suzanne zingers in the show, Bloodworth-Thomson said she didn't want to be accused of ignoring the departed. Suzanne, though she admitted, "it always overwrote, and maybe I overwrote the Suzanne jokes."

But, she added, "I did the same Suzanne Sugarbaker jokes we've been doing for five years. The fact is, we were saying goodbye to a character who was a pain in the butt. I didn't realize how much the audience — or some critics — might perceive that as a personal attack on Delta. Despite all the grief that Delta Burke caused, we really do wish her well." Contrary to the public's impression, Bloodworth-Thomson said, she rarely spoke with Burke, much less engaged in shouting matches with her.

"I never even said anything as harsh as, 'Gee, Delta, do you think you could make a better effort to be on time?'" Bloodworth-Thomson said. When asked if Burke had trouble being on time for filming, she laughed, suggesting that was the least of Burke's problems.

The "Designing Women" set "is a happier place" without Burke, Thomason said.

HOLLYWOOD — For 12 years, cable television's only channel expressly for kids, Nickelodeon, has been without the most common staple of all children's television programming: cartoons.

Although the channel has shown animated specials and wowed the industry with its colorful snafu IDs, the high cost of quality animation has discouraged Nickelodeon from developing weekly animated pro-

gramming.

That is about to change in a big way. Nickelodeon has invested top dollar in three distinctly different animated series — "Doug," "The Ren & Stimpy Show" and "Rugrats" — that the channel hopes will provide the same legacy for Nickelodeon that Looney Tunes has for Warner Bros. or "Tom & Jerry" for MGM or Mickey Mouse and the gang for Disney.

"We know that kids like animation, and that good quality animation lasts forever," Nickelodeon presi-

dent Geraldine Laybourne said. "Looney Tunes are 50 years old and they still play today."

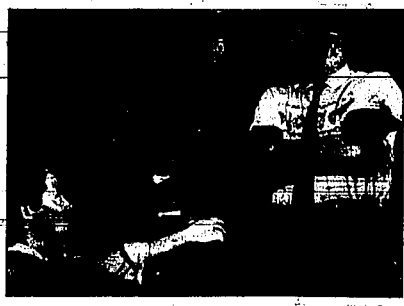

MOBSTERS (R), The early rise of Bugsy Siegel, Frank Costello, Meyer Lansky and Lucky Luciano gets the "Young Guns" treatment in this stultifying, shallow gangster opus. Christian Slater and Patrick Dempsey are among the Munchkin-like personages involved in this mess.

HOT SHOTS! (PG-13), Though it doesn't seem possible that there could be a pinhead's worth of difference between this off-the-wall comedy and "Naked Gun 2½½" in fact this is the funnier movie. For one thing it is a specific parody (of "Top Gun") and even profane humor works better when there is a reason for the fall. For another, Charlie Sheen has an enviable deadpan panache and he and Valeria Golino are a much more engaging couple than the pair in Brand X.

POINT BREAK (R), Surf's down... Director Kathryn Bigelow is obviously some kind of visual virtuoso as she's proven both here and in "Near Dark" — but with this churning, scintillating sea thriller about a college football star turned FBI

agent (Keanu Reeves) infiltrating a gang of surfers who moonlight as bank-robbers in Nixon, Reagan and LBJ masks, she's hit depths of wiggly absurdity that would beach anyone. The movie — a whirl of steadi-cam, catch-that-wave, car-chase and sky-diving scenes — could use more conscious and less unconscious humor: like the kind supplied by Patrick Swazze as the blond-ringed, yuppie-hating bandit guru.

BILL AND TED'S BOGUS JOURNEY (PG), That most excellent, bodacious, non-beinous, "party on" pair, Bill and Ted (as impersonated by Alex Winter and Keanu Reeves), the pride of San Dimas and writers Ed Solomon and Chris Matheson, have been most egregiously killed and sent to Hell, Heaven and parts beyond — besides being replaced with evil Bill and Ted robots and subjected to utter awesome Big Sequel indignities. Much better than the first movie — though the fantasy and visual style (modeled partially on Terry Gilliam, Tim Burton and Michael Powell) may be too incandescent for fans of the original's what-the-hell throwaway humor.

TERMINATOR 2: JUDGMENT DAY (R), Are two Terminators better than one? They are when James

Cameron, the most gifted action director of his generation, is in charge. Usually showing his special-effects mischance and complex bravura effects, Cameron (flamboyantly underlines (with a lot of help from Arnold Schwarzenegger) why the pure adrenaline rush of motion is something motion pictures can't live for long without. This is one hell of a wild ride; a Twilight of the Gods that takes no prisoners and leaves audience desperate for mercy.

'Hot Shots!' shoots down 'Terminator'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Charlie Sheen movie spoof "Hot Shots!" overpowered "Terminator 2: Judgment Day," ending Arnold Schwarzenegger's four-week reign as box office champ.

The fly-by-parody, which lampoons everything from "Top Gun" to "Dances With Wolves" and "Cave With a View," earned \$10.8 million in its premiere weekend to claim first place on the charts. "Hot Shots!" springs from the same writers and directors who made "Airplane!" and the "Naked Gun" movies.

"Terminator 2" collected \$8.6 million for second place and passed "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves" as the summer's biggest hit, according to figures released Monday by Exhibitor Relations Co. Inc. "Terminator 2" has made \$147.7 million to date, compared with "Robin Hood's" haul of \$134 million.

"Doc Hollywood," a new comedy starring Michael J. Fox as a plastic surgeon running out of patience, debuted in third with sales of \$7.3 million. In fourth was the inner-city drama "Boyz n the Hood," which made \$3.6 million. The re-release of "101 Dalmatians" took fifth place with proceeds of \$3.6 million. "Robin Hood" was sixth and collected \$3.3 million. "Mobsters," a sort of "Young Guns" take on the Mafia, fell nearly 40 percent from a week ago to seventh place on receipts of \$3.1 million.

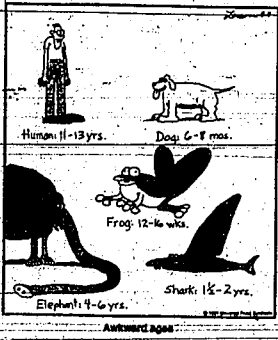

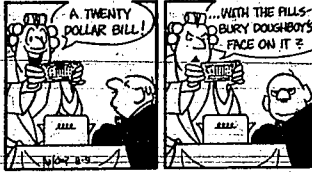
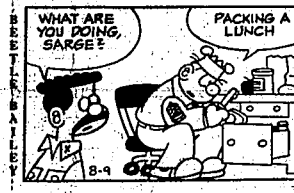

PGA Championship's 1st round cut short

CARMEI, Ind. — In an eerie replay of a tragedy two months ago, a spectator was struck and killed by lightning during Thursday's opening round of the PGA when a brief but intense thunderstorm ripped over the lush acres of Crooked Stick.

And once again a killer storm eventually caused an overnight postponement of first-round play.

Twenty-seven players were stranded on the sudden course by darkness Thursday night and were scheduled to return Friday morning, weather permitting, to complete their first rounds.

At least two, Tom Sieckmann and Larry Mize, had a chance of catching overnight leaders Ian Woosnam and Kenny Knox. Sieckmann was four under par with two holes to play, Mize three under with three to play.

Woosnam, the Welshman who owns the Masters title, and Knox, a chipper journeyman on the American tour, completed their 5-under-par 67s shortly before the storm caused a 1-hour, 46-minute delay.

A lightning strike during the delay killed Thomas Weaver, 39, of Fishers, Ind. "It is at times like this that we realize there are far more important things in life than golf," PGA executive director Jim Awtry said.

Weaver's death came less than two months after six spectators were felled and one killed by lightning during the first round of the U.S. Open at Chaska, Minn., on June 13.

Woosnam welcomed the heavy rains that accompanied the violent storm, but the short-hitting Knox did not.

"I like it a bit wet," Woosnam said after his round over the very long but, at the time, relatively dry course.

"I don't need rain," Knox said. "You've got some long-ball hitters out there are going to play good and if it rains, there's a part of us that gets it."

"It didn't just rain, it rained hard — a third of an inch in just 30 minutes. More rain was forecast Friday, threatening further disruptions in the last of the year's Big Four golf events and playing into the hands of the game's longer hitters."

The Pete Dye-designed course, listed at 7,289 yards, was set up Thursday at 7,281, the longest ever for a major championship. With the rain, it will only play longer.

"When somebody yells 'Hey, one-putt,' I

look up," Knox said. "I'm a great chipper and putter. I can chip and putt with anybody in the world, but I'm not long."

Woosnam is. Despite his 5-foot-4½ stature, the Masters champion is one of the longest hitters in golf. So are Sandy Lyle, Bruce Lietzke, Craig Stadler and Tom Purtzer, Ray Floyd and John Daly and all

were among the leaders.

Lyle, a former Masters and British Open champion from Scotland, Lietzke and Stadler were tied with Ken Green at 68.

Floyd, who counts two PGA titles among his four major championships, was tied at 69 with Purtzer, Daly, Jim Hallet, Andrew Magee and Billy Ray Brown.

Lightning kills PGA spectator

CARMEI, Ind. — Lightning killed a spectator at one of golf's major championships for the second time in two months Thursday during a heavy thunderstorm that interrupted the first round of the PGA Championship.

Thomas Weaver, 39, a business executive, town board member in suburban Fishers and father of two, was struck on his left shoulder as he was going to his car in a parking lot, about a mile from the 15th fairway at Crooked Stick Golf Club.

A nurse and five doctors who had been watching the tournament and were in the lot tried to revive Weaver, and the Hamilton County Rescue Squad administered CPR as he was rushed to nearby St. Vincent Central Hospital. He arrived there in full cardiac arrest and was pronounced dead when doctors could not establish a sustained heartbeat.

"It's a pretty unfortunate thing," said golfer Ken Green, who was on the course when the storm hit. He remembered the U.S. Open at Chaska, Minn., in June, when one person was killed and five others injured by lightning as they huddled under a tree during a storm delay.

"At the Open it hit me hard," Green said. "It doesn't seem right that someone can come watch us play golf and then someone has to tell his family that he dies."

There were questions at the Open whether storm warnings were adequate to protect the gallery. The warnings Thursday were posted an hour before play was suspended, almost an hour and a half before the lightning struck.

U.S. men find success in 800, hammer throw

HAVANA. — An American runner inspired by Che Guevara captured a gold as U.S. and Cuban athletes, revving up for a long-delayed clash in the Olympics, savored triumphs against each other in the Pan American Games.

Anna Quirot, Cuba's queen of track, and countrywoman Liliana Allen ran to their second gold, while American's belonged track and field team finally celebrated with 1-2 finishes in the men's 800 and hammer throw and a gold in the pole vault.

Americans Ocky Clark and Terri Davis grabbed the gold and silver in the 800, and Jim Driscoll and Judd Logan did the same in the hammer throw. Pat Manson won the pole vault at 18 feet, 1-2 inches.

Clark, who won in 1:46.91, said he got pumped up by a quote from Cuban revolutionary martyr Che Guevara about the willpower of champions "that he read in an American newspaper a few days ago."

"I could feel we'd been taking a beating," said Clark, 29, of Sanford, Fla. "People say we didn't bring all our best, but we brought some of them."

American Sheldon Blockburger showed some of that willpower in the decathlon as he roared back from behind to take the bronze. Blockburger had led the decathlon after seven events, but fell back when he couldn't cope with the crossroads and failed to clear the bar in the pole vault.

Refusing to quit, he finished second in the javelin and third in the grueling 1,500 at the end of the main medal. Pedro Ferreira of Brazil won the decathlon and Cuba's Eugenio Balanque took the silver.

Another Brazilian, Robson da Silva,

Cuban and U.S. athletes, who have faced each other in international meets but not in the Olympics since 1976 — Cuba has said it will have a team at the Barcelona Games next year — are vying for dominance of these games.

Cubans and Americans tangled in Greco-Roman wrestling, the home team coming out ahead with six golds to four for the U.S.

Colts linebacker says he's clean and sober for 1st time in years

Linebacker Quintus McDonald says he's playing football free of drugs and alcohol for the first time since his junior year in high school.

"I'm an alcoholic and an addict. I no longer have qualms about saying that," McDonald said. "I live my life day to day, and my main goals are just staying clean and sober. The rest will take care of itself."

The 6-foot-3 McDonald, a sixth-round draft pick, is starting his third year with the Colts after playing at Penn State.

His admission at training camp cleared up a mystery that has lingered since he spent five weeks on the non-football injury-illness list at midseason last year. "The club wouldn't discuss the situation, and McDonald declined to talk about it when he returned."

Now McDonald says being open and honest about his problems makes them easier to handle. "This is a whole new thing for me, and I'm excited to see what the results will be," he said. "Alcoholism and addiction is strong in my family background."

McDonald, the nation's top-rated high school player coming out of Montclair, N.J., High School, said he didn't know how good he could be because his mind was too foggy from substance abuse.

"I was the party animal," he said. "I'd always been that way. But now I'm going to be the football animal."

In accordance with NFL regulations, McDonald undergoes random and frequent drug testing.

McDonald has been impressive in training camp and gave a strong performance in the club's opening exhibition game at Denver last week. He's playing at a sleek 252 pounds and subbing for the injured Duane Bickett at right outside linebacker. Last year, his weight ballooned to 270.

Dolphins

Dan Marino will miss the battle of Florida on Saturday.

Coach Don Shula said Thursday he wants to get a look at backup quarterbacks Scott Mitchell and Scott Secules, who are battling for

the No. 2 job, and thus Marino won't play against Tampa Bay.

Marino's rest comes at a time the offensive line has been depleted by injury, including a knee injury to Pro Bowl tackle Richmond Webb that will keep him out for two weeks.

On Wednesday, left guard Keith Sims severely sprained his left wrist. Sims missed practice Thursday but is expected to start Saturday with a protective wrap around the wrist.

Jeff Delenbach, slated to be the starting center, will shift over to left tackle and Bert Weidner, usually the right guard, will play center. Rookie Gene Williams will go to right guard.

"This was the time we felt we should give him some time off and let the other two guys a chance to play," Shula said. "The Webb injury didn't enter into that decision."

Shula said that he had planned all along to keep Marino out of one of the five exhibitions. Marino, one of the NFL's most durable quarterbacks, sat out one game in each of the last two years.

Shula also said first-round draft pick Randal Hill, who signed early this week, may return kicks Saturday.

Saints

Quarterback Bobby Hebert pulled a groin muscle in practice, and it wasn't known whether he will be able to take his turn at quarterback for the New Orleans Saints in Saturday night's exhibition game against Green Bay.

"I haven't had anything like this since seventh grade," Hebert said. "I'm probably the most flexible on the team. I always pride myself on stretching and things like that. It was just one of those things."

Chiefs

Steve DeBerg, Kansas City's starting quarterback, said Steve Traulner walked out of the Chiefs training camp because he lost interest in the game.

"As far as Steve was concerned, he just kind of lost his desire for the game," DeBerg said. "He was forcing himself to do it. He couldn't convince himself to do it just for the money."

Fallier, the backup to DeBerg, walked out Wednesday after meeting with coach Marty Schottenheimer.

"If your heart's not in it, it's a pretty tough deal," DeBerg said. "Maybe the desire will come back, but the hunger will come back. Right now, he's kind of frustrated with the game of football."

Giants

Joe Morris, the New York Giants' leading career rusher, showed good form against his former teammates for the Cleveland Browns in a scrimmage Wednesday.

The 5-foot-7 running back darted through the line, made a cut and was quickly into the end zone from about 15 yards out. He also showed speed on sweeps and was a well-used outlet receiver.

The teams are practicing this week at Lakeland Community College before meeting in an exhibition game Saturday night at Cleveland Stadium.

Morris, 30, missed 1989 with a broken foot, then was cut at the end of training camp last season.

"When I was out for two years, I was still thinking Giants. Everything was Giants, Giants," said Morris, who was signed by Cleveland's new coach, former New York defensive coordinator Bill Belichick.

"I got here and it's a whole new system, a whole new thing. Everything I learned before is thrown out the window. I'm like a rookie almost. The only difference is, I've got experience. I know how to get ready for games."

49ers

San Francisco not only beat Denver Wednesday night, but got a boost from a player it can use, third-year running back Keith Henderson.

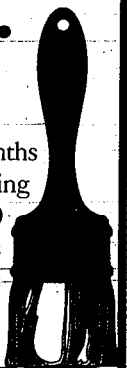

Jockey reaches Hall of Fame pinnacle

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. (AP) — Pat Day could not hold back the tears.

In 18 years in racing, the jockey has seen his share of peaks and valleys. On Thursday, Day reached another pinnacle when he was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame.

Also inducted were trainer Mesh Tenney and thoroughbreds Hill Prince, Princess Rooney and Black Helen.

Day, who is a recovering drug addict, struggled to control his emotions.

"I wish I could be as cool here today as I am on the racetrack," said Day, wiping away tears.

Hall of Fame jockey Ron Turcotte, who presented Day with his plaque, hailed him as a "legend in your chosen profession."

He noted how the fierce temper Day displayed in his early years gave way to the control and patience that became his trademark.

"I wanted to whip everybody — including me," Turcotte said. Turcotte rode Secretariat in his

Triple Crown year of 1973 before being paralyzed in a spill.

Guest speaker Col Campbell, president of Dogwood Stable and owner of Summer Squall, recalled how Day coolly maneuvered the horse "from behind a wall of horses" to win the 1989 Hopeful Stakes at Saratoga.

Day has won more than 5,000 races and purses of more than \$100 million. He was the nation's winningest jockey from 1982-84, joining Bill Hartack as the only rider to win three consecutive titles. Among his many stakes wins are the 1985 Preakness with Tank's Prospect, the 1989 Belmont and Travers with Easy Goer, and four Breeders Cup races, including last year's Classic with Unbridled.

Day, who does most of his riding at Midwest tracks, won Eclipse Awards as the nation's outstanding jockey three times. But he said entering the Hall of Fame is "the granddaddy of them all."

"Words really don't describe the way I feel," Day said. "You have a lot of peaks and valleys... that's life in general. But it seems more concern-

ated in racing. One day you're on the mountain peak, the next day you're in the valley."

Last Friday, the 37-year-old Day won five races at Arlington and came back the next day and won six more. Day, who once won eight of nine races on a card at Arlington, shrugged off his last week's feat, giving all the credit to his agent and horses. "It was a great prelude to the induction," he said.

Tenney, who retired in 1988, was a top trainer in the 1950s and '60s, saddling such stakes winners as Candy Spots, winner of the 1965 Preakness, Olden Times and California Kid. But it was Swaps that gave Tenney his biggest win by defeating Nashua in the 1955 Kentucky Derby.

Illness kept Tenney, 83, from leaving his Arizona home to attend the ceremony. His daughter, Janice Sipherd, accepted his plaque and said her "father was always devoted to his horses."

"He said he never needed a vacation because he was always doing what he really wanted," she said.

Former Rangers president avoids indictment

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — A grand jury decided not to indict the former president of the Texas Rangers, who was involved in the fatal shooting of a middle-of-the-night intruder.

Mike Stone told police he shot Jenice Miller, 47, once in the neck

on May 10 after she walked up a flight of stairs to his bedroom. He said the woman broke into his west Fort Worth home about 5 a.m. through French doors at the rear of the house.

The Rangers fired Stone last September. He had been president of

the baseball franchise for seven years.

Stone was never charged in the shooting. Instead, police referred the case to the grand jury, a common procedure when residents kill intruders. The grand jury non-billed Stone on Tuesday.

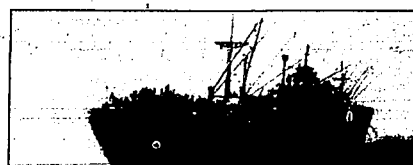

Albanian military takes over ports

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — Albania put its Adriatic ports under military control Thursday to clear out thousands of people trying to flee to Italy, Albanian TV reported.

Italy declared an emergency along its Adriatic coast to block the wave of refugees, but an Albanian freighter packed with about 10,000 Albanians defied the blockade and docked at Bari, Italy.

Despite efforts to turn them away, Albanian refugees swam to shore and thousands jam the port at Bari, Italy.

A navy frigate, 10 cutters and two tugs blocked the harbor entrance but the Albanian freighter, the Vlorë, ignored their appeals to turn back and forced its way into port, said Lt. Francesco Palumbo of Bari port authority.

Authorities urged youths crowding the harbor to remain in the country and return to work, an Albanian journalist said by telephone from Tirana.

"As many as a thousand people just threw themselves into the water," Palumbo said.

State TV said one man was shot aboard a ship in Durres. Another was shot by police clearing the harbor.

Bus plunges into ravine

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — At least 20 people were killed when a bus slid off a mountain road and plunged into a ravine, Press Trust of India said Thursday.

Sixteen passengers were injured in the mishap Wednesday night, near the town of Pauri Garhwal in Uttar Pradesh state, the news agency said.

Croatian truce holds; peace elusive

A Croatian guardsman was killed and five other Croats injured by Serb shelling at Topusko, in Banija, the Croatian news agency HINA reported. It said Croatian forces did not return fire.

BEIJING — Sino-Japanese relations are approaching a new high point of friendliness with the scheduled arrival here Saturday of Japanese Prime Minister Toshiki Kaifu for a four-day official visit.

Shahpour Bakhtiar, 76, and his top aide, Fouroush Katibeh, were discovered by Bakhtiar's son at the well-guarded home in Suresnes, west of Paris. They were killed sometime Wednesday night or Thursday morning, police said.

Will Smith keeps on rapping it up in Monday's 'Fresh Prince' series

By Christopher Hull

Growing up in West Philadelphia, support actor Will Smith, who stars in the successful NBC Monday-night series "Fresh Prince of Bel-Air," watched his share of television, but he didn't necessarily identify with all he saw. That's why, when Smith got the opportunity to star in his own television series, he insisted on doing things his way.

On "Fresh Prince," Smith plays a teen-ager from the urban East who moves to the West Coast to live with his very well-to-do aunt and uncle and their family.

It's a fish-out-of-water concept that hardly breaks new comedic ground, but the show has aimed to be more than a three-jokes-a-minute ripula comedy. Also starring are James Avery as Will's uncle, Janet Hubert as his aunt, Alfonso Ribeiro, Karyn Parsons and Tatyana Ali as his three somewhat spoiled cousins, and Joseph Marcell as the family butler.

"There were just shows that I didn't want to be like," says Smith. "Because I watched them when I was younger, and now I see the images that they left in my mind. So I try not to leave images like that in this series."

Pressed for an example, Smith mentions "a lot of the images in 'Good Times.' Not that they were completely wrong, because I'm sure that there are some households that are like that. I just would have preferred to see black America portrayed in a more positive light, to make me think that I can strive for

more than working at the chicken house. I want to see black people living like they do on 'Dynasty' to make me feel like I can strive for that, rather than to make me feel that I can't have that."

The ease with which Smith has moved into television should come as no surprise to anyone familiar with Smith's success as a rap artist prior to his "Fresh Prince" gig. Smith began rapping at the age of 12, and by the time he was 18, Smith, along with Jeff Townes, his partner in D.I. Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Prince, was well-known in the world of rap music, with several hits (including "Girls Ain't Nothing but Trouble") and a 1988 Grammy for Best Rap Performance ("He's the DJ, I'm the Rapper") under his belt. This summer the duo's fourth album has produced yet another chart-topping hit, "Summertime." Smith's

comfort in front of a camera became plain in the video for "Parents Just Don't Understand." In fact, it was the exposure of his rap videos that was ultimately responsible for making people sit up and take notice of his acting ability.

"It's very different," Smith says of his work experience since moving over to television. "This is really my first shot at acting. It's just... it's different worlds. But in a way, it's an extension of something that I was already doing. It's a new step, a new plateau. It's basically the same character that I was doing, the same humor."

Elvis spotted again in summer reruns as ABC lands atop Nielsen rating list

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC won its third consecutive week in the network ratings contest, this time aided by Roseanne Barr and a resurrection of Elvis.

A repeat of "Elvis and Me," the 1988 TV movie based on Priscilla Presley's autobiography, and a redux of the blue-collar comedy series "Roseanne," helped ABC finish first with an 8.8 average rating, according to figures released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

CBS finished second with an 8.6 average. The usually first-place NBC was third with 8.5.

Each ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

Summer reruns were in full force during last week's schedule. Of 86 prime-time entertainment broadcasts, only 18 contained original programming.

"Roseanne," starring Barr, was the most-watched show on television, followed by CBS' news magazine "60 Minutes."

ABC's "Coach" sitcom ranked third. No. 4 was CBS' "Designing Women."

NBC's reality series "Unsolved Mysteries" was fifth. "Murphy Brown," which precedes "Designing

Time for a change on 'Baby Talk'

New television shows based on hit movies are supposed to be especially blessed because most people already know what they're about and don't have to be bludgeoned into tuning in for at least a sample look.

Now I'll tell you about one that not only wasn't blessed, but might even have been cursed.

It's called "Baby Talk." You may have seen it around the halfway mark of the past TV season — and lived to regret it. Nestled among the four "TGIF" comedies on ABC's Friday night lineup, it collected a huge pile of bad reviews, but not many fans who couldn't face life without it.

At first, "Baby Talk" seemed a surefire hit. It was under the care of Ed. Weinberger, one of TV's most successful writer-producers, whose hits date back to "The Mary Tyler

Moore Show." It also starred Connie Sellecca, a well-known TV star from ABC's popular "Hotel" drama series.

And it was based on one of 1989's biggest hit movies, "Look Who's Talking."

But trouble nipped at its heels from the start.

Just before "Baby Talk" was due to go into production, Sellecca left. It was, the network said, a mutual decision. Nobody wanted Sellecca playing the unwed mom of a baby who "thinks" with the voice of Tony Danza, including Sellecca.

Without a new star to stand in for Sellecca, Weinberger couldn't deliver the show on time, and ABC had to remove it from the fall lineup.

Then, when Weinberger hired former "Newhart" star Julia Duffy to take over the role, all the scripts had to be revised. Sellecca is tall, dark and dramatic and Duffy is short, blond and comedic.

Nor was it helpful that Duffy soon learned to hate her role. She wanted out, out, out. But, guess what? Come Friday, Sept. 20, at 9:30 p.m. ET, "Baby Talk" will have its season premiere. If we're lucky, none of us will recognize it.

Gone are Weinberger, Duffy and everybody else in the cast except Paul and Ryan Jessup, the twin babies who share the role of little Mikey. (Danza returns as the baby's voice.)

The setting will shift to an apartment building in Brooklyn Heights and the story won't stop so often to let us "hear" Mikey's thoughts.

Mary Page Keller, who last season played a single mother on ABC's "Life Goes On," will take over the role of Mikey's mom, Maggie, and Scott Baio ("Happy Days," "Joanie Loves Chachi") will play her new boyfriend, James, a young musician-composer who lives next door.

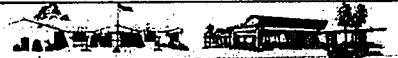


