# Gorbachev commences own purge

MOSCOW — President Mikhail S. Gorbachev purged his government Thursday of the "ferocious and crafty" men who tried to oust him and promised a renewed push for democratic reform.

But he was immediately challenged by the soaring popularity of the man credited with rescuing him, Boris Yeltsin.

Yeltsin's Yeltsin! tens of thousands of flag-waving, whistling demonstrators shouted on Red Square, just beyond the walls of Gorbachev's Kremlin office. They demanded Gorbachev resign and suggested he go on another vacation.

"Shame!" marchers cried as they passed the Defense Ministry, whose chief was involved in the failed coup. "Hangmen!" they shouted outside the headquarters of the KGB, whose chairman also participated in the overthrow. The crowd cheered as cranes dismantled a 14-ton statue of secret police founder Felix Dzerzhinsky, a symbol of the dreaded and once-awesomely powerful of the KGB.

Fireworks lighted the evening sky over Moscow as the jubilant capital celebrated the coup's collapse.

Among other fast-moving developments:

- Soviet troops in the Lithuanian capital
- Miners in the country's largest

withdrawing from the broadcasting tower they had occupied since a Jan. 13 clash in the Baltic republic killed 14 people. Lithuanian lawmakers banned the republic's Communist Party and ended ownership of its property.

Another Baltic republic, Latvia, said it was seeking the arrest of its hard-line party leader, whom Gorbachev denounced for supporting the coup.

President Bush lifted the freeze on economic help to the Soviet Union and said he sees an opportunity to accelerate the talks leading to independence for the Baltics.

Coalfield, who had answered Yeltsin's strike call during the takeover, went back to work. But they refused to ship any coal until coup leaders are punished.

Editors at the leading Communist newspaper, Pravda, said the daily would no longer be the organ of the party's leadership bodies, although it will remain a party newspaper on a less-official basis.

Gorbachev, moving quickly to tighten his grip on power and punish the plotters, detailed his purge of the hard-liners, including Defense Minister Dmitry Yazov. He named a new defense minister, acting KGB chief and interior minister and said he would do everything to "drive out the reactionary forces from the Communist Party."

Gorbachev promised punishment for the plot's ringleaders as well as "a proper evaluation of those who waited on the sidelines and refused to oppose" the three-day coup.

He gave a dramatic account of the harrowing 72 hours he spent as a captive of the coup leaders.

# Jerome starts split sessions

JEROME — Buses rolled in, students chatted, and teachers smiled and welcomed the first alumni of the new Jerome Middle School.

All in all, the first day of school Thursday for the controversial split-session program went off without a hitch.

"It went really well," said school superintendent Will Brown. "The students were quiet and orderly, the teachers competent and well organized. For the first day, it was as good as any day I've seen."

Overcrowding and the failure of the school to pass a bond issue at the polls forced administrators to call for split sessions for sixth, seventh and eighth graders.

All along, a citizens committee has protested the plan, saying it would cause more problems than it could solve.

Robert Bingham, school board trustee, said the school is still at work looking at alternatives to split sessions.

"We aren't anywhere near coming up with a solution," he said in a telephone interview Thursday.

At 6 a.m. and in the dark, Ryan McMillan, a 12-year-old seventh grader, was the first split-session student to board a school bus beginning the new school year.

"It's OK, but a little early in the morning to catch a bus," said McMillan, who lives northwest of Jerome.

McMillan had a 1-hour bus ride before arriving for his first class at 7 a.m.

McMillan also had a full afternoon after he arrived home, including fitting in homework, housework and watching over his sister, Nikole, 10, who attends elementary school. His parents both work in Jerome.

Under split sessions, morning classes begin at 7 a.m. and end at 12:15 p.m. Afternoon students will attend from 12:30 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. Some students will arrive home at about 7 p.m.

Daily lunches will be served at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The menu for the first day was changed from last year; so food could be packed and carried, instead of being served and eaten at the cafeteria tables.

Students have 15 minutes to eat lunch, pick up their things and line up, according to food director Barbara Draper. Some teachers will allow the lunches to be eaten in classrooms, she said.

At least one person Thursday said he is not upset with the new plan.

"I'm tickled to death about the new plan," said Draper.

# Bush advice: Move fast with reforms

KENNEBUNKPORT, Maine — Soviet president Mikhail S. Gorbachev should capitalize on the failure of his hard-line opponents by accelerating economic reforms and granting independence to the Baltic republics, President Bush said Thursday.

With the coup defeated, Bush said he would resume previously suspended technical economic assistance for the Soviet Union, but refused to offer new financial aid to Gorbachev to help bolster his standing.

The Bush administration has adopted a wait-and-see attitude toward altering U.S. relations with the Soviet Union as events in that nation continue to unfold and Gorbachev makes his next moves.

A senior Bush aide told reporters Thursday the administration would like to see Gorbachev, now free of the need to appease conservative old-guard critics, move boldly to improve ties with the West and work closely with reformist Boris Yeltsin, president of the Russian Republic.

If Gorbachev pursues economic reforms, the official said, "it may be possible to accelerate it (economic assistance) significantly," the official said.

There was a split Thursday in the administration's assessment of Gorbachev's vulnerability to a further coup attempt and his choice of Gen. Mikhail Artyekyevich Moiseyev to head the nation's armed forces.

Bush said he thought that the hard-line opponents of Gorbachev had learned they could not turn back the clock in the Soviet Union. "Anybody attempting another coup from now on will be out of their minds," Bush said.

But a senior administration official briefing reporters a few hours before the press conference warned that the attempt to oust Gorbachev "may not be the last."

In a similar division of opinion, Bush voiced his objections to Gorbachev's choice of Moiseyev to head the military and noted that the United States had worked with Moiseyev in finalizing the details of the recently-negotiated arms control agreement on long-range nuclear weapons.

But the senior aide said that Moiseyev "to put it generously was ambivalent" about the coup attempt. "I wouldn't want that guy behind me in a dark hall now," the adviser bluntly said.

# Nuisance waiver to stay in county dairy ordinance

TWIN FALLS — A nuisance waiver and a grandfather clause that have some rural residents of Twin Falls County steamed will stay in the county's soon-to-be-enacted dairy ordinance.

With a few small changes, the law will be ready to go on the books soon, according to county commissioners Norma Blass and Jim Fraley.

The commissioners will hold a hearing on Sept. 9 at 10 a.m. in their office in the courthouse. Those who want to talk about the law can do so then.

The commission can vote on the law that day, publish it soon afterward and have the rules in effect 30 days after that.

"We can come back in six months if something really doesn't work," Blass said. Despite protests of a number of people, the nuisance waiver will remain in the law. People moving in the county have signed the waiver for the last few years and officials now want the waiver included in the law.

Agriculture plays too important a role in Twin Falls County not to have a nuisance waiver on the books, the commissioners say.

"It makes it your responsibility to be aware of the normal agricultural operations," Blass said.

# Daily libation cuts risk of heart attack, study says

LONDON — Two drinks a day reduces the risk of heart attack by more than a quarter, according to a study of 44,059 men published in this week's Lancet.

Among 27,717 men who have never been diagnosed as suffering from heart disease of a related illness, those who drank between a half and 2½ drinks a day reduced the risk of heart disease by 26 percent, said Dr. Eric Rimm, who directed the study.

"We found a dose response, with the more alcohol consumed, the more reduced the risk for heart disease," said Rimm, of the Harvard School of Public Health.

Previous studies that have shown a link between moderate drinking and reduced risk of heart attack have been criticized because of the assumption that many non-drinkers have been advised to abstain because they were already suffering from a heart condition.

That would mean more people prone to heart disease were in the low-drinking categories, biasing the results.

Rimm said his study showed the same beneficial effect of alcohol even after excluding men who suffered from heart disease, or related illnesses such as diabetes, gout and hypertension.

**Public favors school choice, uniform testing**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Americans support the Bush administration's idea of letting children attend public schools of their choice, but most balk at using public money for private education, according to a poll released Thursday.

The annual Gallup-Phi Delta Kappa Poll of the Public Attitudes Toward the Public Schools also found that four-fifths of those interviewed favor national achievement standards and goals for local schools. More than three-fourths say standardized national tests should be used to measure achievement.

Secretary of Education Lamar Alexander hailed the results of the poll, saying it showed the public was behind the administration's drive to improve the nation's education system by the turn of the century.

"The poll clearly shows that the American people support the use of national standards and national tests of academic achievement, the right of parents and students to choose the public school that children will attend and tests in the core subjects of math, science, history, geography and English," Alexander said in a statement.

The public favored by a margin 62 percent to 33 percent allowing students and parents to choose which public schools in their community the students attend. However, few parents whose children attend public school said their youngsters would change schools if given the choice.

President Bush has broadened the concept of public school choice to include private and parochial schools. He wants money targeted for groups of disadvantaged children in schools

to follow individual students to schools of their choice in the form of vouchers.

The poll asked respondents if they favored a voucher system in which the government would allow a certain amount of money per student and then allow parents to send the child to any public, parochial or private school. Fifty percent favored such a proposal, while 39 percent were opposed. Support rose by 6 percentage points over 1987.

However, 68 percent of those interviewed said they opposed "allowing students and parents to choose a private school to attend at public expense," while 26 percent favored the idea.

The voucher plan found its strongest support among minorities and urban residents, 57 percent in

each group. Fifty-eight percent of those with children under 18 supported the idea, and 66 percent of non-public school parents backed it.

Among parents with children in public schools, 26 percent said lack of proper financial support was the biggest problem public schools face. Eighteen percent cited lack of discipline and 17 percent use of drugs.

Officials said the Gallup-Phi Delta Kappa poll is the most comprehensive survey of American attitudes on educational issues since the series began in 1969. This year, Gallup interviewed a selected sample of 1,500 American adults a total of 80 questions, twice the usual number. The margin of error was 3 percentage points.

Americans approved, by a margin of 81 percent to 12 percent, requiring local public schools to conform to national goals and national standards of achievement. They also approved 68 percent to 24 percent requiring public schools in their communities to use a standardized national curriculum, and they favored 77 percent to 17 percent the use of standardized national tests to measure academic achievement.

**Boy Scouts ditch Confederate flag**

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Boy Scouts of America is dropping the Confederate flag from its insignias in the South after an 18-year-old white member protested its use was offensive to blacks.

In response to a letter from Paul Hudson, Chief Scout Executive Ben H. Love announced the organization no longer would use the Confederate flag during official activities.

"The recommended flag for display is the flag of the United States of America," Love said Aug. 6.

**3 new charges bring Dahmer case total to 15**

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Prosecutors filed charges against Jeffrey L. Dahmer in three more dismemberment slayings Thursday, raising to 15 the number of people he is formally accused of killing.

No charges have been filed in two other slayings, one in Wisconsin and one in Ohio, that authorities say Dahmer has admitted. A prosecutor here said he did not plan any more charges.

One of the new charges alleges Dahmer had sex with a 14-year-old boy, then drugged and strangled him at the suburban West Allis home of Dahmer's grandmother.

The complaint said Dahmer dismembered the boy, identified

as James Doxtator, and smashed the bones with a sledgehammer and disposed of them."

He identified Doxtator by describing two small scars on his chest and from a photograph, the complaint said.

No remains have been found in any of the three new cases.

Victims Richard Guerrero, 25, and Edward Smith, 28, also were identified by Dahmer through photographs, the complaint said.

It said Dahmer had sex with all three victims before killing them.

**Anti-smokers talk tough tactics**

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP) — The commandos of the anti-smoking movement laid plans at an international conference Thursday for boycotts, guerrilla tactics, and even civil disobedience to keep cigarettes away from teen-agers.

About 200 activists opened their sessions with several verbal salvos at the tobacco companies, which one organizer called the "anti-health industry."

The conference was organized by the Springfield-based Stop Teenage Addition to Tobacco, or STAT, to develop grassroots strategies for limiting the sale and advertising of tobacco products to adolescents.

It was attended by doctors, teachers, health administrators, law enforcement officials and community organizers from as far away as Israel.

**Deadly blast costs Phillips \$4 million**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Phillips 66 Co. has agreed to pay a record \$4 million to settle allegations of worker-safety violations stemming from a 1989 blast that killed 23 people at a Texas chemical plant, the government said Thursday.

The company also has agreed to implement corporate-wide safety management procedures and launch new employee training programs about hazardous chemicals, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration said.

OSHA originally proposed a \$5.7 million fine against the petroleum company, charging it with 575 "willful" and "serious" safety violations at its Houston Chemical Complex.

Phillips, in settling the case, agreed to pay \$4 million, which will be the largest amount collected in OSHA's 20-year history. OSHA director Gerard Scannell said the settlement would allow immediate safety measures "rather than causing delays through prolonged litigation."

**Coup failure blessing for Eastern Europe 4 dissident supporters expelled**

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Eastern Europeans heaved a sigh of relief Thursday with the failure of the Soviet coup, and leaders said their young democracies would only benefit from the brush with Stalinist ghosts.

The coup galvanized Western moves to help integrate the former Soviet satellites into the world community, and dealt perhaps a final blow to hard-liners hoping to reassert control over the former East Bloc.

The threat "made many Western politicians aware of how important the region... is. It was spoken more plainly than ever before how essential it is to bring East-Central Europe closer to the West," wrote Kazimierz Woycicki, editor of

Poland's Zycie Warszawy daily.

"We should be very grateful and thankful to Comrade Yanayev," said Silviu Brucan, a veteran Romanian politician, referring to the Soviet vice president who was among the coup leaders.

"Western powers now realize that if they do not provide the eastern countries with more substantial aid, the danger of a (Communist) comeback is always alive," Brucan said.

Czechoslovak Foreign Minister Jiri Dienstbier echoed the sentiment, saying, "Western aid to the new democracies in central and eastern Europe can no longer be based on words and treaties only."

One day after the coup began, the European

Community, meeting in Brussels, promised to speed up negotiations to link Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Poland to the 12-nation organization as its first associate members.

"The sooner we do that... the better for reforms in the Soviet Union," Polish President Lech Walesa said Thursday.

"We can show and prove the supremacy of reforms, and greater effectiveness of reforms," Dienstbier said the question of providing a defense arrangement for Eastern Europe was crucial.

Although the Warsaw Pact has dissolved, NATO is unwilling to accept new members, leaving Eastern Europe feeling vulnerable.

BEIJING (AP) — The government on Thursday expelled four women, including two Americans, who had traveled to China to press for improved prison conditions for two dissidents on a hunger strike, officials said.

Wang Juntao and Chen Ziming began their hunger strike earlier this month to demand their prison conditions be upgraded.

The two, accused of engineering the 1989 pro-democracy movement, have been held in solitary confinement in cramped, dirty cells the past five months.

**Crowd demands statue come down**

MOSCOW (AP) — Thousands of angry protesters converged on KGB headquarters Thursday, demanding that a 14-ton monument to the founder of the Soviet security forces be torn down.

The crowd painted slogans including "Fascist" on the monument to Felix Dzerzhinsky, a Polish aristocrat who was asked by Lenin to organize the first Soviet internal security force.

"We will take it down," said Moscow Deputy Mayor Sergei Stankevich, using a microphone and loudspeakers to address the crowd from near the base of the statue. "Work will begin today."

Two cranes drove to the statue but Stankevich said additional machinery was needed to pull the bronze statue down.

He warned the crowd, however, not to commit "provocations," because "that could lead to tragedy."

Despite Stankevich's appeal, young boys painted a Nazi swastika on the face of former KGB chief Yuri Andropov on a plaque on the front of the KGB building. Others painted the word "Freedom" on the building. The window of one of the main entrances was broken.

The KGB is widely accused of supporting the 3-day-old coup and its chief, Vladimir A. Kryuchkov, was one of the coup leaders. Kryuchkov was fired Thursday and arrested. The KGB pledged to respect the Soviet Constitution.

The monument to Dzerzhinsky was erected in the 1950s and stands in front of KGB headquarters, known as the Lubyanka. The square used to be called Dzerzhinsky Square, but was recently renamed Lubyanka Square by Moscow's reformist City Council.

The 10-story headquarters building of the KGB, or Committee for State Security, was an interrogation center and one of the most feared prisons in the entire country.

There was no sign of activity in the building Thursday. Lights were turned off.

The crowd began gathering about 4 p.m. It repeatedly shouted for the statue to be toppled.

"I am a World War II veteran. I lived through lies all my life, but I am glad I lived long enough to see this," said Alexander Lipich, a white-haired retiree.

"The KGB waged war and eliminated millions of people — our Russian people, the best people," he said. "The KGB must be destroyed, they are traitors."

As darkness fell, fireworks over the nearby Russian Parliament building lighted the sky.

**Soviets will honor Iraqi agreements**

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev sent a message to Iraqi President Saddam Hussein Thursday, saying the Soviet Union will stick to its international agreements, the official Iraqi News Agency reported.

The message, as reported by the news agency, made no reference to Saddam's quick move Monday to praise Gorbachev's ouster. Iraq said it had suffered under the Soviet leader's policies and his removal would prevent U.S. dominance of international affairs.

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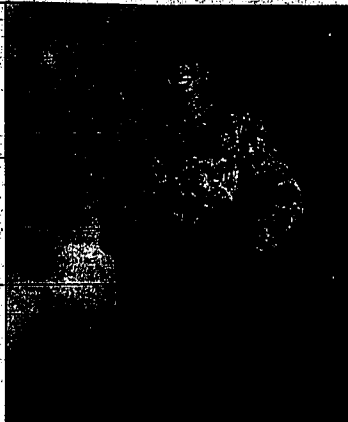
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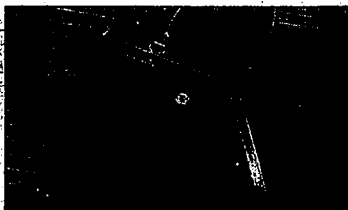
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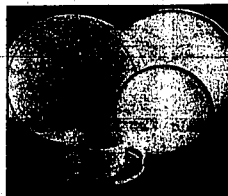

**Man charged in stabbing death of wife**

**BASALT** — A Bingham County man has been charged with first-degree murder for the stabbing death of his wife. Jesus Moreno, 39, is accused of killing Carol Ruby Moreno, also known as Carol Ruby Martinez, 31, who was found dead shortly before 9 p.m. Wednesday at the couple's home near the Basalt townsite. An autopsy was being performed. Sheriff Roy Nelson said Moreno also received multiple stab wounds from a hunting knife. He was taken to Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center in Idaho Falls, where he was listed in critical but stable condition Thursday.

**2 killed when car plunged over embankment**

**INKOM** — Two McCammon residents were killed when their car plunged off a county road and over an embankment, Idaho State Police said. Donald A. Carlton, 37, and Anita F. Miller, 24, were thrown from their car late Wednesday. It was northbound when it drifted off Marsh Creek Road. The car rolled about 100 feet before coming to rest on its top, a State Police dispatcher said. Two passengers in the back seat, Jennifer Crawford, 17, of Inkom, and Ken Pannell, 23, of McCammon, were treated at Bannock Regional Medical Center in Pocatello and released.

**ACLU representative says jail 'one of the worst'**

**POCATELLO** — The regional representative of the American Civil Liberties Union, fresh from a two-day inspection of facilities in Pocatello, is labeling the Bannock County Jail "one of the worst" he has ever seen. Steven Pevar, who returned to his Denver headquarters on Thursday, said that in 15 years of suing local governments in the Intermountain West over their jail conditions he has seen few more serious cases. "The community should have done something about this sooner," Pevar said. The inspection by Pevar and health and sanitation engineer Ward Duell came less than two months after the ACLU sued the county in federal court over jail conditions it claimed violated inmates' constitutional rights.

**Workers evacuated after chlorine tank ruptures**

**LEWISTON (AP)** — Most of Potlatch Corp. pulp and paper mill employees in Lewiston were evacuated after a tank at the chlorine dioxide plant ruptured. The tank containing a sodium chlorate and water solution ruptured at about 4:30 p.m. Wednesday after a brief power failure. Officials believe the outage may have caused the spill. About 21,000 gallons of the sodium chlorate, a salt solution used to produce bleaching chemicals for the paper-making process, poured onto the floor of the plant, company spokesman Michael Sullivan said.

**Pregnant woman became ill after drinking water**

**MOSCOW (AP)** — A pregnant woman has become ill from drinking water, unaware of the University of Idaho's boil-water order. UI student Kate Wilcox was treated at Grisman Medical Center for stomach cramps, nausea and diarrhea after drinking the contaminated water. It is the fourth boil-water order since last August. Bacteria reportedly flourished in stagnant water in the school's lines. Other residents of Park Village Apartments have complained of symptoms from water contamination, said Deborah Reece, president of family housing.

**Tribe risks revenue loss if tax push continues**

**FORT HALL (AP)** — The Shoshone-Bannock tribes risk losing their bid for a share of state highway revenue if they continue pushing for the right to impose property taxes on Fort Hall Indian Reservation land, Power County Commissioner Ralph "Moon" Wheeler says. Wheeler has been working with Shoshone-Bannock leaders on legis-

lation that would provide the tribes with funding from state highway user fees and taxes and establish Indian jurisdiction over highways on reservations. But he said Thursday that the effort would fail if Shoshone-Bannock officials insist on provisions authorizing tribes to raise money for road maintenance through property tax levies, like local highway districts. "My ability to sell this would be hindered if the property tax was in there," Wheeler told tribal leaders. "I'm just telling you, politically this ain't going to fly." But William Brower, chairman of the tribal tax commission, said levying property taxes would allow the tribes to assume responsibility for

services provided to people living on the 544,000-acre Fort Hall Indian Reservation. "It does not mandate anything. It just opens the door," Brower said. The tribes have been working for several months on drafting a tax code allowing them to collect taxes on people doing business on the southeastern Idaho reservation.

**Man expected to plead guilty to wife's slaying**

**IDAHO FALLS (AP)** — Richard McCuskey of Idaho Falls plans to plead guilty to a voluntary manslaughter charge for his wife's stabbing death, McCuskey's attorney says. "There will be no reason for a trial," Jerry Woolf told 7th District Judge Marvin Smith at a pre-trial conference Thursday. McCuskey is accused of killing his wife, Arlene, March 10 at their Idaho Falls home. Mrs. McCuskey, 45, was a special

education teacher at Eagle Rock Junior High School. Her husband also is charged with using a deadly weapon in a felony. Woolf and Bonneville County Prosecutor Kimball Mason said they are still discussing that charge, but don't anticipate any need for a trial. Smith had scheduled trial Sept. 3 for McCuskey. But Woolf said his client intends to plead guilty to voluntary manslaughter on or before that date.

**Paper: Sheriff may have foiled dealer's arrest**

**BOISE (AP)** — A reputed cocaine kingpin in the Silver Valley may have eluded arrest in 1988 because of his relationship with the Shoshone County sheriff, a Spokane newspaper reported Thursday. Charlie Burns failed to show up when the sheriff's department planned a sting operation to catch him selling drugs in fall 1988, the Spokesman-Review and Spokane Chronicle reported in a copyright article. "Charlie told me, he held up two fingers, you know, indicating togetherness and he said, 'Me and your boss, we're just like this. We're tight,'" former Deputy Ernie Peyer said this week, recalling a 1987 conversation.

Peyer was fired by Cmkovich on July 26, accused by the sheriff of taking documents for the federal government's investigation into graft in Shoshone County. Peyer has denied taking the documents and is trying to get his job back. He said he testified before a federal grand jury last week about the sheriff's relationship with Burns.

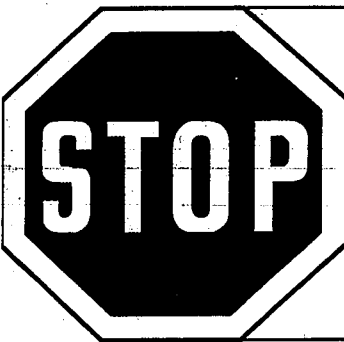

**Candidate blasted for not backing INEL bid**

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho Republicans are taking every shot they can at the Democrat trying to claim the Senate seat held by the retiring Steve Symms while one prominent party leader is hoping to avoid an internal battle for the right to succeed Symms.

At a party gathering to honor former Sen. James McClure in Idaho Falls, Republican Sen. Larry Craig accused the Democrat's 1992 Senate candidate, Congressman Richard Stallings, of basing out on the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory's bid for a multibillion-dollar nuclear weapons reactor.

Stallings said the attack was unwarranted. And McClure, the campaign chairman for GOP Senate front-runner Dirk Kempthorne, tried to head off a potentially divisive primary battle next May by urging possible challengers to the Boise

mayor to weigh their decisions carefully. "It's a little more difficult when you ask your friends to choose among friends," McClure said Wednesday night. "This is not just an ego trip for people who've been involved in politics."

Kempthorne was at the gathering along with already declared Senate candidate Milton Erhart, the Boise stockbroker who as a relative political unknown claimed 30 percent of the vote in the 1990 governor's primary, and potential candidates state Sen. John Hanssen of Idaho Falls and former state Sen. Rod Beck of Boise.

Former GOP Attorney General Jim Jones, who was not at the gathering, has raised some concern about what a number of party people have called the "anointing" of Kempthorne as the party's Senate standard-bearer next year. In the heart of INEL's support, Craig claimed

Stallings, whose district includes the Energy Department complex, has failed to lobby hard enough to convince the government to place the New Production Reactor in eastern Idaho.

"He's been running away from the INEL for the last year," Craig declared, claiming the congressman has been following the lead of Gov. Cecil Andrus.

The governor has supported building the \$5.6 billion reactor at INEL but has put the government on notice that a permanent solution to disposing of radioactive waste must be found before any new projects are undertaken.

"Wherever Cecil Andrus is, Richard Stallings goes," said Craig.

He appeared to be picking up the attack Symms launched early this year on Andrus, coloring the governor as opposed to INEL.

**Air Force base 1 step closer to new mission**

BOISE (AP) — Mountain Home Air Force Base could get its long-awaited composite wing in a year's time, if an environmental impact study does not uncover problems with a proposed training range, Air Force Secretary Donald Rice says.

"We have to go through a very careful process with the environmental impact study before a final decision can be taken about the makeup of the wing," Rice said Wednesday after touring Idaho's largest military facility.

The base was spared the budget ax in a recent round of proposed base closures, but will change its mission from radar-jamming jets to a new composite wing.

The wing will be made up of several types of aircraft used in battle, including fighters, bombers and fueling tankers.

The Air Force and state officials indicated in the past the fate of the base could be tied to the proposed 150,000-acre training range in the Owyhee desert.

"Depending on the findings (of the environmental study), it could have some effect on the overall size of the activity that could be supported," Rice said.

"We're not aware of problems up

front that have to be worked around in any way."

But a conservationist questioned the need for the training range, used in conjunction with the existing 112,000-acre Saylor Creek bombing range.

"With a composite wing using the range, there would be a dramatic increase of flight traffic," said Brian Goller of the Idaho Conservation League.

"The highhorn sheep are very sensitive to noise, and there are real fears they would be driven out of the area."

Rice said an environmental impact study and public hearings should be completed by February.

"Working out a compromise on the training range arrangements is a key part of what we need to do, and it's being treated as part of the environmental impact process."

Rice said some new construction is needed to accommodate the composite wing, and the base would remain about the same size as it was before the new mission.

"Mountain Home popped up near the top of the list for places that satisfied the criteria for long-term capability for operating and good flying conditions," he said.

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**Suit filed over cash secured for wrestling**

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — A Coeur d'Alene man has sued a wrestler-turned-FBI-informant, contending he was swindled out of \$97,000 and made to fear for his life.

Robert Swartz's lawsuit alleges that Rico Renaldo Valentino took the money from Swartz to promote and later pay legal fees for a wrestling match that never took place.

Valentino's whereabouts were not immediately known.

Swartz discovered the scam in August 1990 after learning that Valentino, also known as George Weston Jr., had infiltrated the Aryan Nations at Hayden Lake for the FBI, the lawsuit states.

Three members of the white supremacist group were convicted on conspiracy and firearms charges for the plotted bombing of a Seattle nightclub. Valentino testified against them.

The lawsuit, filed Monday in 1st District Court, alleges that Swartz gave Valentino \$10,000 to promote a wrestling match at the Spokane Coliseum featuring Hulk Hogan and Andre the Giant.

The lawsuit alleges that Valentino told Swartz the match was canceled because Hogan refused to appear.

"None of that could have possibly happened," said Steve Planamanta, a spokesman for the World Wrestling Federation, in Stamford, Conn.

Hogan and Andre the Giant are both under exclusive contract to the federation, he said.

"We don't farm out our talent to outside contractors," Planamanta said Thursday.

"Any attempt by (Valentino) to make believe he could book any of our wrestlers is a total fabrication on his part. We've never been involved with this individual."

Swartz then gave Valentino more money to pay for a lawyer to sue Hogan and the World Wrestling Federation for breach of contract, the lawsuit states.

A week before the breach-of-contract trial supposedly was to start, Valentino told Swartz his lawyer had died in his sleep, the lawsuit says.

Swartz also contends that Valentino told him he had hired another lawyer and that a federal judge had ordered the wrestling federation to pay a fine if the matter was not settled.

Planamanta said he had no knowledge of such a lawsuit.

# Administration OKs drilling ban along coast

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration said Thursday it intends to ban oil and gas drilling off about half the Washington Coast, one of the last wilderness coastlines in the continental United States.

Under its new proposal, the administration would consider lifting the drilling prohibition in the year 2000, but the burden of the repeal would be placed on drilling advocates.

"It appears to be as good as we could have expected from an administration that seems to have an endless thirst for oil," said Rep. Jolene Unsoeld, D-Wash.

Unsoeld is seeking a permanent ban on drilling in the area.

Sen. Brock Adams, D-Wash., was less enthusiastic. He said loopholes in the administration proposal may not adequately protect the state's shores and fisheries.

"Oil and water don't mix," he said Thursday. "We need a permanent ban on all drilling off the coast of Washington."

In 1988, President Reagan signed a bill calling for designation of a national marine sanctuary off the Olympic Coast — stretching from near Grays Harbor north about 100 miles to the Canadian border.

Bush administrators, reluctant to forgo the energy resources, had resisted setting the formal

boundaries or implementing rules for management of the coastal waters.

But the delay ended Wednesday when the Office of Management and Budget approved a draft environmental impact statement prepared by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, a NOAA official said.

"The Olympic Coast National Marine Sanctuary is designed to protect the mammals, birds and other aquatic life of the most pristine coastline of the lower 48 states," NOAA said in a statement announcing the formal proposal.

The sanctuary runs 35 to 40 miles wide from Copalis Beach to the tip of the Olympic Peninsula, covering more than 3,400 square miles.

# Robbery suspect killed

SANDPOINT (AP) — A Sandpoint police officer fatally shot a man who drew a gun on him after allegedly robbing a drugstore of morphine tablets, Police Chief Bill Kice says.

Officer Steve Feldhausen stopped Jeff Chamberlain's car on Baldy Mountain Road early Wednesday. Chamberlain, 34, got out of his car, pulled out a pistol and aimed it at Feldhausen, Kice said.

Feldhausen fired one shot at

Chamberlain from about 20 feet away, Kice said Thursday. Chamberlain still had his gun in his hand when other officers arrived at the scene, where he died, Kice said.

Investigators later discovered that Chamberlain's gun was not loaded, Bonner County Sheriff Chip Roos said. Wads of brown paper had been stuffed into the chamber of the see-through cylinder to look like bullets, Roos said.

USA Basketball is trying to build a U.S. Olympic team that will never be forgotten.

The selection committee is looking for a Dream Team — led by Magic Johnson, Michael Jordan and Larry Bird — that couldn't be matched after the novelty of NBA players in the Olympics wears off and the prospect of a hot summer in a cramped athletes' village is not so attractive.

"It would be so exciting having a team

with those three," Bird's lawyer, Bob Woolf, said Thursday. "It would never be forgotten."

Johnson, Charles Barkley and Karl Malone haven't wavered in their desire to play since 1989 when the door opened for Olympic participation by NBA players, and it's impossible to imagine that all-NBA players would not be invited.

Nice start. Those three and the college guys who went to the Pan Am Games might be enough to bring home the gold from Barcelona.

But from that beginning, a once-in-a-

lifetime club that also includes Jordan, Bird, Patrick Ewing, John Stockton, Scottie Pippen, Chris Mullin and David Robinson reportedly is set.

But C.M. Newton, chairman of the 13-man selection committee, said no formal invitations would be issued until next month.

For now, Newton said, the committee is working from a pool of top players, determining the degree of each player's interest.

"Our desire is no different than ever before," Newton said, "and that's to put

together the best possible team that can be put together. But the uniqueness of this being the first time for NBA players is there."

## Darrington swings to easy win

**BURLEY** — Karen Darrington has had some special moments at Burley Municipal Golf Course — and another one showed up Thursday enroute to the Ore-Ida Women's Amateur Golf Championship.

"That's probably the best I've ever played here," said the Twin Falls native who now lives in Boise of the five-under par 71 she posted. "Five birdies and one eagle."

"I bogied the first hole (a five-par) and then I thought I had hit my tee shot No. 2 into the water. But the ball stayed up and I managed to get a great chip within a foot of the cup. So that gave me a par three instead of a probably double bogey five," Darrington said.

"That kind of got me rolling," she added with a smile.

She went on to putt for eagles on each of the remaining five pars but managed to get just one — No. 8 — and settling for birdies on three of the four others.

She corrected the major portion of her opening-day troubles on the par threes, this time getting past the four tests one over. Wednesday she was three over.

"The only one I bogied was No. 5 but I birdied the next hole to get that stroke right back," she said.

Darrington said the Ore-Ida would wound up her competitive season.

"I think I'll be playing in another two pro-ams but that will be about it. I probably won't play in the Tournament of Champions because I really don't feel that comfortable playing on Sunday and that's a Saturday-Sunday tournament," she said.

## BSU enters 1991 season with untested passer

**BOISE** — Boise State Coach Skip Hall admits it's a little scary to go into the 1991 football season without a quarterback who has thrown a single pass in a Bronco's game.

"He certainly is short in actual game experience, but he has been in our program for three years, and he knows our system thoroughly," Hall said of junior quarterback Jeff Mladenich. "Early on, it will be important for us to not give him too much too fast."

Boise, coming off a 10-4 season that included two victories in the Division I-AA NCAA football playoff, is counting on a favorable schedule to help Mladenich.

"The good news is that we get to play our first four games at home. That will give us our quarterback and some other new players a chance to play in friendly confines and hopefully develop some confidence before we have to go on the road," Hall said.

The Broncos opens Big Sky Conference action Sept. 21 against Eastern Washington.

Last year, Mladenich played behind seniors Duane Halliday and Mike Virden and appeared in only two games. "We will have a much more mobile and

versatile quarterback than we have had for the last three years. But there is no getting around the fact he has not played a lot," Hall said.

But All-Big Sky running back Chris Thomas returns.

Thomas' starter has rushed for 2,626 yards and 25 touchdowns. He gained 919 yards last season on 231 carries despite a variety of injuries.

Hall said the star-tailback is healthier this fall.

"I'd like to get the ball into Chris' hands without endangering him. We want to use him, but not abuse him. We will use him as much as we possibly can," he added.

Junior David Tingstad returns at fullback and 6-foot-6, 245-pound tight end Larry Stayner is back. But other skill positions will have new faces.

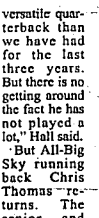
at one receiver position and Chris Sweeting and Mike Wilson will battle for the other.

It appears that Boise State's strength, at least early, will be the defensive secondary. The Broncos will start an all-senior and all-senior line.

Although the game doesn't come until Nov. 23, Hall acknowledged that he will be thinking about a way to beat arch-rival Idaho, which has defeated Boise State for the last nine years.

If he has a plan, he isn't talking about it. "I wish I could tell you. We will play the first 10 and then we will worry about that one," he said.

Jobless claims rise sharply; recovery stalling, analysts say

WASHINGTON — A surprising surge in unemployment claims this month has many analysts convinced the Federal Reserve must raise interest rates further to keep the economy from a relapse into recession.

The Labor Department said Thursday that 430,000 Americans filed initial jobless claims last week, an increase from 395,000 the week ending Aug. 10. That was a spurt of 22,000 over the previous week — and more than five times the increase anticipated by most economists. "There's no question — the economy has

run out of steam, run out of gas," said Jack Albert, who heads an economic forecasting firm in Washington. "The economy is going nowhere fast." Allen Slinkin, chief economist at the Boston Co., "It's still an open question as to whether we're out of the recession."

"Time is running out for the Fed to meet its own expectations" for economic growth for the third straight month, said a White House spokesman. The Bush administration, "faced with a presidential election next year, contends the recovery is here but has kept up pressure for lower interest rates. Most economists don't

expect the Fed to decide until after the next employment report comes out Sept. 6. The report, which showed layoffs dragging on and a failure by business to hire, may mean that the unemployment rate in August didn't improve, either, analysts said.

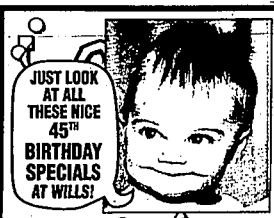

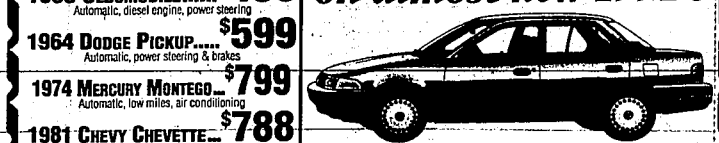

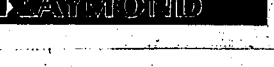

## Waste-free CD box is music industry's challenge

They're long, slim and sleek—but tough to open and environmentally wasteful.

So it should be good news for many that the long box, the 5-by-11-inch cardboard container that holds the compact disc in its plastic jewel box, is about to go the way of the LP—into extinction.

What's not so good is that nobody knows what will replace them. Or when.

The search for a new CD package has mired the music industry in corporate politics, vested interests and varying agendas. The stakes are high: More than

250 million CDs are sold each year, accounting for 36 percent of recorded music sales — and those figures are growing. "Enormous profits will be the reward for whoever ends up with the franchise for the new package."

But can a package be found to satisfy the demands of consumers, retailers and manufacturers? And, if all those factions can't be served by one package, whose wishes and needs are paramount?

"We have to balance all those concerns," says Tim Sites, a spokesman for the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA), a Washington, D.C.-based lobby organization for record companies. "The

companies are investigating a number of alternatives. We want to find something that's environmentally friendly, but we also want to find something that's durable."

Adds Bill Thom, vice president of Detroit's Harmony House chain, "It's a matter of the industry — the manufacturers and retailers — working together to find the right solution."

Only one thing is certain: The long box is headed toward the grave. The RIAA declared that in March, and the rest of the industry followed suit. The move was a no-brainer, research by a coalition called Ban the Box revealed that the discarded long boxes created 23 million pounds of garbage

in 1990, a contradictory practice for an industry that has long embraced environmental causes.

Long boxes haven't disappeared, however, and they're likely to stay until a uniform alternative is chosen. Retailers have always liked the long box because it fits two-abreast in the bins that used to hold albums, thus saving them the huge cost of refitting their stores. In fact, the National Association of Record Merchandisers has asked that any new package have the same dimensions.

Consumers, meanwhile, are concerned

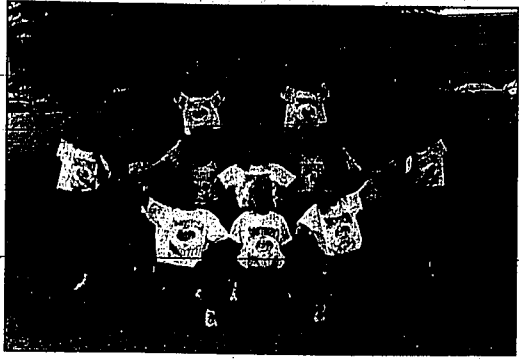

### 6th will be last in Elm Street series

When the sixth installment of the popular horror series "A Nightmare on Elm Street" opens Sept. 13, fans will witness the murder of the villainous Freddy Krueger — and the end of the line for "Nightmare," New Line Cinema's most lucrative franchise. Why? "The controlling issue was an aesthetic one," says New Line Chairman Robert Shaye. "We were bereft of creative inspiration. ... There were still secrets, still unanswered questions lingering (about Freddy). Once we answer those, there's not a lot more to do. So it's appropriate and justified to bury the old guy."

There were other factors behind Freddy's demise: For one, Robert Englund, the actor who turned Freddy into one of the most popular horror villains in Hollywood history, had decided that he wanted to move on.

In addition, while the series has grossed more than \$460 million in box-office and video sales, production costs continue to rise (the latest film cost \$10.5 million, up from \$7.5 million for "Nightmare 5") while ticket sales have slowed. Box-office grosses reached a peak of \$50 million with "Nightmare 4" in 1988 but dropped to \$25 million for "Nightmare 5" in 1989.

"It gets to the point where our investment and creative energies could be better spent," Shaye says. The upcoming "Freddy's Dead: The Final Nightmare" offers fans a new gimmick: Freddy's demise takes place in 3-D "Freddy vision."

But that may not be consolation enough for fans distraught over Freddy's death. Shaye says he has already received some angry mail, and adds that he won't be surprised if there's more to come.

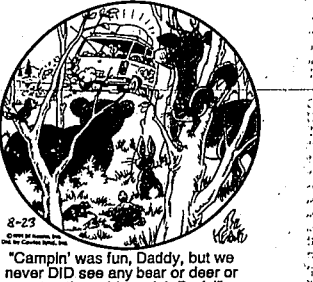

Martin Short plays Proctor in the new comedy "Pure Luck" and there is a certain poetic irony in that fact. For though Short is without doubt one of the most convulsively funny comics working in Hollywood, his career has been similarly snakebit. His performances, such as the pathologically wily agent in "The Big Picture," often have the touch of genius about them, but they almost always come in films that are more or less forgettable. And this latest, worse luck, is not an exception to that rule.

Based on "Le Chevre," a French farce written and directed by the dauntingly prolific Francis Veber ("La Cage aux Folles," "The Tall Blond Man With One Black Shoe," among many others), "Pure Luck" (rated PG) doesn't expose us to the hapless Proctor right away.

First off we meet the similarly accident-prone Valerie Highsmith (Sheila Kelley). Daughter of fabulously wealthy insurance magnate George Highsmith (Sam Waterman), she foolishly goes off on an unescorted vacation to Mexico and, after surviving a number of harrowing accidents, suddenly disappears off the face of the Earth.

Enter now company psychologist Dr. Monosoff (the invariably funny Harry Shearer), a man with a plan. The world's reigning expert (in fact the world's only expert) in "conscious misfortune syndrome," Monosoff tells the tycoon that what is needed to find his daughter is someone who is similarly afflicted, someone who is fated to make the same klutzy mistakes she did and thus stumble on her in a way that a more logical mind could never duplicate. Someone named Eugene Proctor.

Highsmith, obviously in desperation, agrees to send Proctor to Mexico, but only if he is in the care of a more traditional, hard-boiled detective, Raymond Campanella (Danny Glover).

In our for Eugene to work at peak inefficiency, however, he has to believe he is in charge, and Campanella, as desperate as his boss, agrees to this ruse.

**BILL AND TED'S BOGUS JOURNEY** (PG). That most excellent bodacious non-bodacious party on pair, Bill and Ted (as impersonated by Alex Winter and Keanu Reeves), the pride of San Dimas and writers Ed Solomon and Chris Matheson, have been most egregiously killed-and-sent-to-Heaven and parts beyond—besides being replaced with evil Bill and Ted robots and subjected to other awesome Big Sequel indignities. Much better than the first movie—though the fantasy and visual style (modeled partially on Terry Gilliam, Tim Burton and Michael Powell) may be too incandescent for fans of the original's what-the-hell throwaway humor.

**CITY SLICKERS** (PG-13). The old gambit of setting a bunch of affluent nitcomps loose in the wide open spaces is not a fresh one,

but it's still funny. There are enough laughs in "City Slickers" to get you through the wispy-washing male bonding stuff. Billy Crystal, Bruno Kirby and Daniel Stern are the three buddies who take a two-week vacation as cattle herders. As the leady guy will guide, Jack Palance steals the movie.

**DOC HOLLYWOOD** (PG-13). Michael J. Fox plays a hot-shot plastic surgeon who travels west to the nip and tuck heaven of Beverly Hills—but gets waylaid in South Carolina, where he learns the value of the simple life. The knock-out corniness and accented makes a TV show like "Green Acres" seem almost Shavian by comparison.

**HOT SHOTS!** (PG-13). Though it doesn't seem possible that there could be a pinhead's worth of difference between this off-the-wall comedy and "Naked Gun 2½," in fact this is the funnier movie. For one thing, it is a specific parody (of "Top Gun") and even pratfall humor works better when there is a reason for the fall. For another, Charlie Sheen has an

enviable deadpan panache and he and Valeria Golino are a much more engaging couple than the pair in Brand X.

**REGARDING HENRY** (PG-13). Sleek, self-confident New York lawyer Henry Turner (Harrison Ford) wakes up in the hospital after being mugged to discover that his brain is back at square one: like a blackboard that has been wiped totally clean, he remembers nothing and no one. Harrison and Annette Bening as his wife give fine performances, and though this film has the makings of a genuine exploration of what matters in life, under Mike Nichols' direction it ultimately turns into a too-slick Hollywood shuffle.

**ROBIN HOOD** (PG-13). A case where more is less, this newest version of the venerable tale can't decide if it's a traditional action adventure, a New Age fable or a Monty Python farce.

Making things even more muddled, star Kevin Costner doesn't have the moxie to play an outlaw king. The action is fine, but at two hours and 23 minutes, everything else begged to be cut.

**THE ROCKETER** (PG-13). This cliffhanger for the '90s is made for a decade of diminished expectations. While films like "Raiders of the Lost Ark" wanted to kill the genre and serve up the action, this is a of fearless Hybry Cliff Secord, a youth with a dream who turns himself into a man who can fly and fight evil at the same time; plays things straighter than one would have thought possible.

The most expensive and faithful recreation imaginable of a Saturday afternoon serial, perfect for the 10-year-old-boy in your life.

**TERMINATOR 2: JUDGMENT DAY** (R). Are two Terminators better than one? They are, with James Cameron, the most gifted action director of his generation, is in charge. Equally at home in small-scale skirmishes and complex, bravura effects, Cameron flamboyantly underlines (with a lot of help from Arnold Schwarzenegger) why the pure adrenaline rush of motion is something motion pictures can't live for long without. This is one hell of a wild ride, a Twilight of the Gods that takes no prisoners and leaves audiences desperate for mercy.

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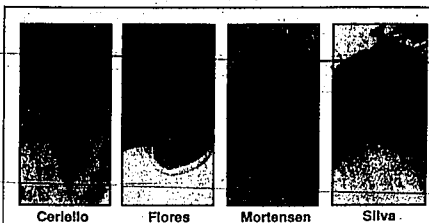

Well, at least THAT'S over. The summer of 1991, that is. At the movies. A few more releases remain, of course, but nothing for which anyone has any major summer-season hopes — it's too late for that. Labor Day, and the movie doldrums, are just around the corner. And given the quality of this summer's films, the doldrums look good.

How bad was it?

Well, a movie called "Life Stinks" was released and few of us even had the heart to make a play on words. Yes, the movie had an aroma, but it was no more noisome than its many, many stablesmates. It was Mel Brooks' take on the homeless. Better it should have been his take on Hollywood.

Here's how bad it was: "Terminator 2: Judgment Day" was the mass-audience must-see. No problem, really — even though the script was a solid candidate for a Brooks job. At least the effects were good.

"Jungle Fever" was the class of the season — a movie that was more about romance than it was about race (though of course it was about race, too).

And then ... and then ... there was "Bingo," the story about the runaway circus dog. Seriously.

There were a few other notable films in between, of course. But on the money meter, there were only four movies that were big box-office hits — "T2," "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves," "Naked Gun 2½: The Smell

of Fear" and "City Slickers." "Boyz n the Hood" and the re-release of the almost intolerably sweet "101 Dalmatians" did decent business. The rest of this summer's crop will wait for word on profits.

As for quality — always, let's face it, a better measure than ticket sales — these dog days were very doggy indeed. Here's the Top 10. As Bingo would say, woof.

**1. 'JUNGLE FEVER'**  
Spike Lee's drama about an interracial romance is his best film, and will endure. Whether the film colony will be able to acknowledge this work comes-Ocean-time — and let's-face-it, Lee is a jerk as well as a brilliant filmmaker — is problematic. If the nominations don't come, Lee will cry racism, and he'll be half right. If he adds jerk-ism to the mix, he'll have it down.

**2. 'THELMA AND LOUISE'**  
A feminist manifesto that sweeps you along for the ride, we said earlier this year. Fun, too. Didn't know Ridley Scott had it in him. No complaints here.

**3. 'BOYZ N THE HOOD'**  
The early hero of the black-film renaissance was Matty Rich, for having made "Straight Out of Brooklyn" as a teen-ager. Trouble was, it looked as if a teen-ager had made it. "Boyz N the Hood," about kids, gangs and L.A., looked like art. John Singleton made "Boyz N the Hood." Remember his name.

And now, the great fall-off.

**'TERMINATOR 2: JUDGMENT DAY'**  
The most expensive film ever made will make a big profit. But — and you read it here first — it will also mark the beginning of the end of Arnold Schwarzenegger's box-office pre-eminence. Why? Because he makes a much better villain than a hero, and the puppy-dog android of T2 was actually a supporting character to Linda Hamilton.

**'THE NAKED GUN 2½: THE SMELL OF FEAR'**  
Even those of us who liked it agree with those of you who say: Can't TOUCH the original.

**7. 'BINGO'**  
That's right, one of the best movies

of the summer is a low-budget comedy about a heroic circus dog. We're talking about a movie that stars Cindy Williams.

**8. '101 DALMATIANS'**  
That's right, another of the best movies of the summer is an apocalyptically sweet cartoon about spotted puppies from the folks at Disney, to whom manipulation is the highest art.

**9. 'ROBIN HOOD: PRINCE OF THIEVES'**

# John Goodman's Dan conveys stability, grabs Emmy nomination for his efforts

As the rumbled but cheerful Dan Conner on ABC's "Roseanne," Emmy nominee John Goodman conveys a stolid sense of stability. The kids may be growing older, the family's problems might be growing more complex, but Dan is a comfortable, familiar presence.

So, in a sense, Goodman is the archetypal nominee as Fox airs the 43rd Annual Primetime Emmy Awards on Sunday, Aug. 25.

The Emmys may be handed out to honor new achievements, but several category lineups are virtual carbon copies of last year's lists of nominees.

To put it another way, everything old is old again.

The awards are merely reflecting the lackluster results of the preceding TV season, which was a big bust when it came to popular new shows. Viewing audiences stuck to what they knew best, and once again "Cheers," "The Golden Girls," "Murphy Brown," "Designing Women" and "The Wonder Years" will battle it out for best comedy series.

On the serious side, Emmy old-timers L.A. Law, "China Beach," "thirtysomething" and "Quantum Leap" are joined in the best drama category by lone newcomer "Northern Exposure." Why that series, which has drawn widespread praise as one of the funniest on the dial, wasn't submitted with the other comedies is a mystery known only to Emmy officials.

In a prime instance of Emmy

irony, canceled series actually fared better in the nomination tally than new series. The now-defunct "thirtysomething," "China Beach," "Twin Peaks" and "Cop Rock" earned a posthumous total of 23 nods.

But "Beverly Hills, 90210," one of the few solid hits to emerge from the past season, came up empty when the nominations were handed out.

"Evening Shade" emerges as the new series with the most nominations, earning a total of four nods for Burt Reynolds and fellow cast members Michael Jeter, Charles Durning and Elizabeth Ashley. Reynolds is the only fresh face among competitors for best actor in a comedy series, who also include Ted Danson ("Cheers"), Craig T. Nelson ("Coach"), Richard Mulligan ("Empty Nest") and Goodman. For

best comedy series lead actress, it's business as usual for Kitzje Alley ("Cheers"), Candice Bergen ("Murphy Brown"), Blair Brown ("The Days and Nights of Molly Dodd"), Delta Burke ("Designing Women") and Betty White ("The Golden Girls").

Ditto for the dramatic lead, female nominees: With the exception of Sharon Gless ("The Trials of Rosie O'Neill"), it's old home week for nominees Dana Delaney ("China Beach"), Angela Lansbury ("Murder, She Wrote") and Patricia Wettig ("thirtysomething").

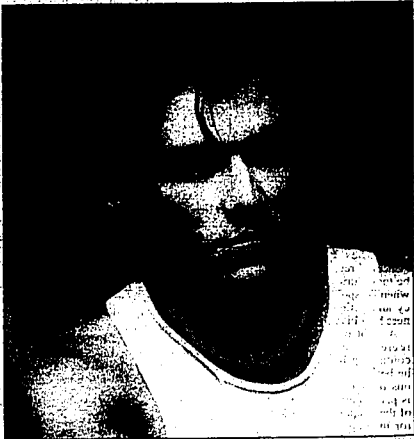

# CBS and ABC tie for 1st place ratings with nights full of reruns — and reruns

LOS ANGELES (AP) — ABC and CBS tied for first place in the latest network ratings battle with lineups in which virtually every prime-time broadcast was a rerun.


ABC's "Roseanne" was the most watched show on television last week. In the overall network ratings, ABC and CBS each finished with a 14.95 average rating. NBC was last with 11.84, according to figures released Tuesday.

Each Nielsen ratings point represents 931,000 homes.

The second-most watched program last week was CBS' news-magazine "60 Minutes."

Tying for third was CBS' hit comedy "Designing Women" and an ABC Sunday Movie broadcast of "Romancing the Stone," starring Michael Douglas and Kathleen Turner.

CBS' "Murphy Brown" was No. 5, "Northern Exposure," the network's hour-long series about day-to-day life in Cicely, Alaska, was sixth. NBC's bar comedy, "Cheers," was seventh, followed by ABC's "Who's The Boss?" Craig T. Nelson's Emmy-nominated performance in ABC's "Coach" was No. 9 and the network's "Full House" sit-

## CNN apologizes

**ATLANTA (AP)** — Cable News Network has apologized for a report about serial killers that was partially lifted from the Aug. 5 issue of Newsweek.

The all-news cable TV network said last week that it was guilty of "using editorial material without credit" during its "The Week in Review" program of Aug. 11.

There were "a number of sentences that were lifted verbatim" from the Newsweek report, CNN spokesman Steve Haworth said.

CNN president Tom Johnson sent Newsweek editor Maynard Parker an apology and issued a stern memorandum to CNN staff.

"We simply will not tolerate such conduct, and appropriate action has been taken," the memo said.

Haworth said strong disciplinary action was taken, but declined to provide details. "I thought it was a very classy and quick apology," Parker said.
