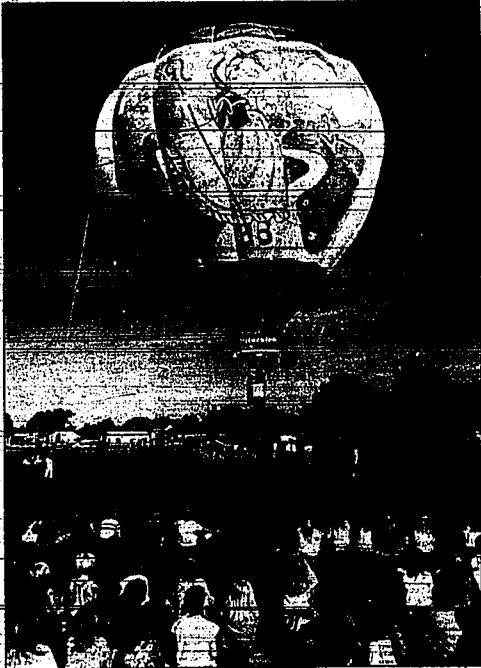

Andrus flays Craig over fish role

BOISE — Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus rebuked Republican Sen. Larry Craig on Thursday for trying to undermine his attempt to restore the Northwest's dwindling salmon runs. The governor used a forum on the salmon issue organized by Craig to claim the senator was bucking near unanimity among other Idaho interests by trying to change his plan for dramatic spring drawdowns of reservoirs on the Lower Snake River to facilitate migration of salmon to the ocean. Craig has raised concerns about the economic impact of the so-called Idaho plan, that has drawn criticism from interests in Washington and Oregon as well. The senator said changes would improve proposal as it is considered by the Northwest Power Planning Council and the National Marine Fisheries Service. "You're the only one who has dissented from this," Andrus told Craig, "and you continue to do nothing but give ammunition to the downriver people" that include the Army Corps of Engineers and the Bonneville Power Administration. Both have objected to changing operations of the hydropower dams. Andrus said Craig attacked the plan as unrealistic at an Idaho Association for Commerce and Industry convention in Coeur d'Alene and then invited "villains" like the Corps to the forum. Craig Chief of Staff Greg Casey said Andrus seemed to be trying to

Gorbachev wins by arm-twisting

MOSCOW — Mikhail Gorbachev twisted arms and curtailed debate to make the Soviet Union's huge, boisterous and unruly parliament give up its authority and transfer power to the republics on Thursday. Gorbachev's ends may have justified his means. He and the 10 republic leaders who were his behind-the-scenes muscle were trying to prevent a civil war and economic catastrophe by turning the country into a loose confederation before it breaks apart entirely. Gorbachev appeared resurgent. He will remain president, will head the State Council and will name the chairman of an Inter-Republic Economic Council that will coordinate the switch to a free market. But Gorbachev's choice of parliamentary tactics, and his reliance on the republic leaders to corral support, revealed the extent to which power had already shifted out of the Kremlin — even before his plan was brought to the Congress. The experience of the four-day Congress of People's Deputies didn't bode well for the country's fragile democracy. "I will not yield the microphone to

anyone from the floor!" Gorbachev barked as lawmakers clamored for more discussion. "You've had three or four days to discuss it... Either make a decision or not. That's all!" he commanded. Hard-liners attacked Gorbachev for railroading his proposals through the 2,224-member Congress. But their words were drowned by a roar of approval as congressmen spilled blood in the coup that briefly unseated the president two weeks ago. But even some reformist lawmakers were appalled. One of them, Sergei Byeloserdtsev, called Gorbachev a "dictator." The Congress started out Monday with a proposal by Kazakhstan's articulate and respected president, Nursultan Nazarbayev, on behalf of Gorbachev and 10 republics. Their idea was to set up an interim system of government — headed by a State Council composed of the president and republic leaders — during the transition to a "free commonwealth" of truly sovereign republics. Parole board says inmate should have stayed in jail

BOISE — The Idaho Commission for Pardons and Parole would not have released an inmate from Twin Falls if it had known prison officials suspected him of plotting an armory break-in, the commission's chairman said. The inmate, Donald Shriver, 25, was released from the Idaho Maximum Security Institution July 24. He was charged last Friday with stabbing his mother near Buhl and assaulting two guards at the Twin Falls County Jail. Bond was set at \$50,000 and Shriver was being taken to the Boise prison the day after his arrest. But the parole board was unaware that the Department of Corrections suspected Shriver of planning to break into a state-run armory at Boise's Old Penitentiary. "We didn't know all the facts. We would have turned him down for parole had we known," said commission Chairman Det. Ray Holm. Frank Chidichimo of Twin Falls was on the commission when Shriver's release date was set. He said Thursday that suspects Shriver was plotting to break

into the armory were not mentioned in the file that the five-member panel used to grant Shriver parole. "If that had been in the file, he would not have been released," said Chidichimo, who resigned from the commission last month. Corrections Director Richard Vernon has requested a full accounting of why the information wasn't passed along. "I don't want to get into an argument with the Parole Commission — in the newspaper," Vernon said Wednesday. "I've asked for a variety of reports on this from our staff. Any comment by me would be premature until I have some solid information." While the break-in never occurred, a map with the layout of the armory and surrounding correctional officers' training academy was found in Shriver's cell several months before the inmate was released, Vernon said. Shriver also reportedly told others he was planning to steal weapons and shoot up the armory, he said. Prison officials took precautions but later concluded the threat was minimal. Wendell rejects school bond issue

WENDELL — Wendell High School students may be reading books in their 70-year-old library for a few more years. A bond issue to replace it — the first in the Wendell School District in almost 20 years — failed at the polls Thursday. A little over 63 percent voted to build a new school to take the place of the original Wendell High built in 1920 and added on to over the years. A two-thirds majority was needed. The unofficial count was 334 in favor and 305 against. "That is so close," said Superintendent Larry Manley. "It was a great turnout. I guess our need is a little greater than our wallet." Turnout was 839 in a town of 1,963 residents. One teacher said more people voted on the bond issue than voted for president three years ago. Manly said the school had no plans to seek another bond issue unless soon to replace the oldest school building still in use in the Magic Valley. "That is an embarrassment to be in a state that requires that kind of (super)majority," said teacher Phyllis Bunn. "It shows we are way behind the times in supporting education." The Wendell school bond issue is the fourth to fail in the Magic Valley in the last year. During that time, Boone-peterson voters turned down a proposal for a new elementary school and Twin Falls voters rejected a \$20 million proposal for a new high school by a 2-to-1 margin in May. Only in Kimberly, which passed a bond issue for a new middle school on the third try last fall, have voters approved a new school. In the mid-1970s, when bond issues were approved, construction of a new high school was to be built on the same site.

Parathion limits cover most uses

WASHINGTON — Makers of the pesticide parathion agreed to toughen new restrictions Thursday, but the Environmental Protection Agency said it will seek to go further and ban the chemical blamed for killing dozens of farm workers. A partial ban on the insecticide parathion could leave Idaho specialty crop growers without their most potent weapon. Popular because of its broad range of effectiveness, parathion has been widely used in Idaho in the past. It has been used on dry peas, lentils, onions and grass seed, and to a lesser degree on beans, sugar beets and potatoes, said the state Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Chemical Bureau Chief Pat McCorty. Newer chemicals may replace parathion in some applications. But for other crop applications few solutions may have to be found, McCorty said. EPA and the producers agreed to limit the highly toxic insecticide to use on minor crops, out of about 90 on which it is currently applied. The action is expected to cut parathion use by at least half from the recent levels of about 3 million to 6 million pounds annually. Environmentalists said the dangers of parathion have been known for decades and should have prompted faster and more decisive government action. EPA Administrator William K. Reilly said the deal "will result in a dramatic reduction in the number of workers who annually are poisoned by exposure to this pesticide." He said, "Those uses which pose the greatest dangers... will be prohibited... and the agency plans to cancel the other uses soon."

Foreign aid agency unveils AIDS plan

WASHINGTON — The U.S. foreign aid agency unveiled on Thursday a stepped-up effort to combat the spread of AIDS in developing countries through programs to encourage use of condoms and to reduce high-risk sexual behavior.

Dr. Jeffrey Harris, AIDS coordinator for the Agency for International Development, said the existing anti-AIDS program will more than double to a level of about \$400 million over five years.

At a news conference, Harris said the investment will be focused on a more limited number of countries so that ongoing programs will be large enough to slow epidemics occurring there.

Pro-Thomas ads remain on the air

WASHINGTON — Conservative groups Thursday spurned a personal appeal from White House Chief of Staff John Sununu to yank a pro-Clarence Thomas television ad attacking the ethics of three Democratic senators.

They said they would keep running the controversial commercial until "left-wing groups ... chief into a political cease-fire" over the Supreme Court nomination.

The White House said Sununu called L. Brent Bozell III of the Conservative Victory Committee on Wednesday evening to urge him to stop running the commercial, which assails Democratic Sen. Edward Kennedy of Massachusetts, Joseph Biden of Delaware and Alan Cranston of California.

"Unfortunately, the administration has no desire to confront the radical left," Bozell, the committee's executive director, and Floyd Brown, chairman of Citizens United, said in a statement.

President Bush has called the ad offensive and counterproductive.

Rock climbers escape alleged attack

HAMILTON, Mont. — A group of rock climbers say they dodged a man-made rock slide in what authorities say was a deliberate attack verging on attempted murder.

For three hours on Monday, the climbers said, they dodged rocks the size of hammers, hurled at them from 1,000 feet above. They were climbing in a canyon northwest of Hamilton, in the Bitterroot Range just east of the Idaho border.

Authorities said they have several suspects, although no arrests have been made.

Rah-rah mom gets 15-year sentence

HOUSTON — A woman portrayed as the "ultimate stage mother" drew 15 years in prison for trying to arrange a murder-for-hire to boost her daughter's chances of making the school cheerleading squad.

A jury imposed the prison term along with a \$10,000 fine Wednesday, hours after Wanda Holloway, 37, of Channahon, begged for probation.

"I think that this trial has been enough punishment for me," a sobbing Mrs. Holloway testified. "I'm totally humiliated. ... I would love a second chance."

Prosecutors had sought the maximum of life in prison for Mrs. Holloway, convicted Tuesday of solicitation of murder.

The jury found that she tried to hire a hitman to kill Verna Health, whose daughter, Amber, was the chief rival of Mrs. Holloway's daughter, Shanna, for a spot on the cheerleading squad.

Stanford U. voluntarily exhumes bill

STANFORD, Calif. — Stanford University has voluntarily exhumed its inoperable bill to the federal government for research, \$1,300 a year for upkeep of a mausoleum where the school's namesake family is buried.

"We discovered this when we were going over our space inventory," Larry Horton, vice president of public affairs, said Thursday. "We've acknowledged there are problems with our accounting system. This is all part of fixing the problems."

Horton said the school charged the federal government \$1,300 a year for half a dozen years during the 1980s for the upkeep of the "philly-guarded-mausoleum-on-campus."

Bush's heart now beating on its own

WASHINGTON — President Bush no longer requires medication to regulate his heartbeat, which became erratic while he was jogging four months ago, the White House said Thursday. Bush is still taking a drug to prevent blood clots, thyroid medication and a chewable, low-dosage aspirin every other day to help avoid a heart attack, said deputy White House press secretary Gary Foster.

But "the president's cardiac medications all stopped approximately two weeks ago," he said.

"President Bush is still in excellent health," with his weight stabilized around 195 to 196 pounds, the spokesman said.

Jury selection begins for Noriega trial

MIAMI (AP) — Jury selection began Thursday for former Panamanian dictator Manuel Noriega with one of the first potential jurors denouncing him as a human rights violator.

The juror's statement demonstrated the difficulties faced by both sides in finding an impartial jury as 96 candidates filed into the ornate courtroom in the federal courthouse to begin Noriega's long-delayed drug and racketeering trial.

The defense, after reviewing 1,200 questionnaires sent out by the court, had presented an appeal last week to seal the jury. One juror indicated that difficulty when the judge asked if anyone knew Noriega.

"I know him as a violation of human rights," said Lesbia Reyna, standing up and looking directly at the seated Noriega. But she admitted she did not know him personally.

Her husband, Dr. Roberto Reyna, was director of the Panamanian Human Rights Committee in Miami, he later told The Associated Press.

"I was very much involved in denouncing Mr.

Noriega, so we were very surprised when she was called," he said. "I guess it was just coincidence."

Mrs. Reyna was one of more than 30 Hispanics on the 96-member panel from which the court will try to select a jury of 12, along with 516 alternates.

The questioning, which jurors such as whether they had ever heard of Noriega, George Bush, Ronald Reagan, Oliver North and other figures whose names will be raised at the trial. They also asked what television programs they watched, whether they ever read a newspaper and whether they ever visited Panama.

Federal investigation of milk scam involves schools, taxpayers in 16 states

ATLANTA (AP) — A federal investigation of bid-rigging on school milk contracts has spread to 16 states in a scandal that has victimized school children and cost taxpayers millions of dollars.

In the latest turn of events, P&I Inc. pleaded guilty Wednesday to violations of the Sherman Antitrust Act for fixing bids for milk contracts in South Carolina.

"In the short run, the kids at school are the victims. If you're having to spend more on milk, you don't have as much to spend on other food for them," said Paul McElwain, chief-of-school nutrition in

Kentucky. "In the long run, the taxpayers are the victims."

Since the investigation began in 1988, the Justice Department has filed 40 criminal cases against some 50 jury companies and executives, including some of the nation's biggest dairies.

Thirty-eight dairy companies and executives have entered guilty pleas and 18 people have been sentenced to prison. Seven companies and executives have been dismissed against two others.

Inspectors find hazards

ATLANTA (AP) — Federal inspectors Thursday found hazardous conditions at a factory producing polyurethane foam for the same company as a North Carolina plant where a fire killed 25 people.

The Atlanta office was voluntarily closed after the Occupational Safety and Health Administration issued an "imminent danger" notice to the Hampton-based firm's plant in Camden, N.C.

The notice warned problems "created an imminent health hazard" and said a "hazardous atmosphere" could exist in the plant.

Makers of toxic art supplies ignoring federal warnings

WASHINGTON (AP) — Many makers of toxic art supplies are ignoring federal law outlawing certain long-term health hazards, a consumer group said Thursday, warning parents of schoolchildren to take special care with such things as rubber cement and permanent markers.

The U.S. Public Interest Research Group said 44 percent of the toxic art products it surveyed omitted labels warning of health hazards such as cancer, nerve or reproductive damage or blood disorders.

"What we found was shocking," said Lucinda Sikes, a staff attorney for PIRG, a consumer and environmental advocacy group.

She said 23 of 52 commonly used art and craft supplies bought at hardware and drugstores earlier this summer didn't comply with the 1988 Labeling of Hazardous Art Materials Act requiring information on health hazards and guidelines for safe use.

The 23 included several products, such as permanent markers, rubber cement and water-based spray paint that often are used by schoolchildren.

Others include supplies such as turpentine, spray adhesive, anti-aging solution and aerosol cleaner that are common among artists and hobbyists.

For example, Sikes said, a glitter product used by children to decorate T-shirts and shoes warns that it contains toluene and that its vapors should not be breathed. But the product doesn't tell consumers toluene is associated with liver and

kidney damage and possible brain damage.

Out of 10 of the 52 products surveyed included a phone number, consumers could call for additional information, as required under the new law, she said.

Manufacturers obeying the law are being penalized, Sikes said, when consumers "mistakenly choose a product that they think is safe because it is not labeled."

Laurie Doyle of The Art and Craft Institute, an industry association, acknowledged "there are products out there that are not labeled the way they are supposed to be."

However, she said "the majority, if not everyone" in her group, which represents most of the industry, labels products properly.

She said the 44 percent violation figure found by PIRG might be due to the long shelf life of some products. The labeling law didn't go into effect until November.

Parents, Doyle said, should look for the institute's seals that mark a product as approved.

U.S. pact with Kuwait won't 'open the door'

WASHINGTON (AP) — A 10-year defense agreement between the United States and Kuwait will increase the U.S. military presence in the Persian Gulf with periodic exercises, joint training and weapon stocks, a Pentagon spokesman said Thursday.

But the pact "does not in any way open the door for permanent U.S. military bases" in the region. Pete Williams said about the agreement expected to be signed later this month.

It's the first such Persian-Gulf agreement completed in the postwar era.

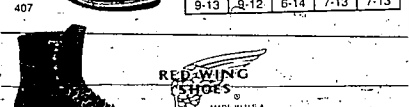
Defense Secretary Dick Cheney went to the region in May to open the way for the negotiations. The resulting upswing in military cooperation with the Arab nations is certain to heighten the U.S. military profile in the troubled area.

"At any given snapshot in time, there will be more U.S. forces in the region," Williams said.

There are many technical details to be worked out, such as the amount and placement of hardware stored in Kuwait and the timing for any exercises.

Convictions stem from deadly weapons use

BOISE — Injuries inflicted by someone using a deadly weapon don't have to be serious for the person to be convicted of aggravated battery, the Idaho Court of Appeals says.

...where the state alleges and proves the use of a deadly weapon as an element of aggravated battery...the nature and extent of the injury suffered by the victim is secondary...the court said Thursday.

The three-judge panel unanimously approved the prison sentence of 7 to 21 years ordered for Mario A. Hernandez Sr. in a Twin Falls County case. One year of the "14-year" (indefinite term) sentence was ordered by District Judge Daniel Meehl as a sentence enhancement for using a deadly weapon, a knife.

The man was convicted of stabbing ex-wife Teresa Galvan eight times in her chest, back and neck. A doctor testified that, although the wounds were superficial, they could have been life-threatening had they been in different locations of the woman's chest.

Hernandez's appeal contended Meehl erred when he did not require the jury to make a specific finding that a deadly weapon was used. The judge ruled that by definition, aggravated battery must include the use of a deadly weapon, and therefore no separate finding was necessary.

The Court of Appeals agreed in a decision written by Chief Judge David Walters.

Sun Valley woman dies in 1-vehicle rollover

ARCO — A Sun Valley woman was killed in one-vehicle rollover on U.S. Highway 20-26 Wednesday night, Butte County Sheriff Cary Van Eiten said.

Lisa J. Blanchard, 34, died at the scene, Van Eiten said.

Blanchard was headed west on the accident scene about 6:50 p.m. two miles west of the junction of U.S. Highways 20 and 26. The sheriff said her car went off the north side of the road and she overcorrected. The car came back on the road, rolled three times and ejected her.

Van Eiten said the cause of the accident is under investigation, but it appears Blanchard was driving more than 85 mph. She was not wearing a seat belt.

Idaho emergency squads increase capabilities

BOISE — The Idaho Emergency Response Commission has 14 new members to coordinate public awareness and regulatory responsibilities, Chief Mayor Tom Condie.

State agencies are represented on the commission, as well as county sheriffs, police and fire chiefs, Idaho cities and counties, hazardous waste or material handlers and users, and the public.

The panel educates the public and develops a state inventory of where hazardous materials are stored or used.

Population increase leads Gooding to make changes

GOODING — Expecting increases in population and industrial growth throughout the coming decade, Gooding County is updating its zoning ordinance.

Commissioners have plans to zone unincorporated areas of the county. Once the current zoning ordinance is repealed.

A meeting on adopting a new zoning ordinance is set for 3 p.m. on Sept. 26 at the Gooding County Courthouse.

One of the most controversial issues to be addressed is containment feeding of livestock.

The new zoning says that containment feeding will not be allowed within a one-mile radius of county residential districts or within one mile of the city limits.

Many residents feel the one-mile limit is not enough space to offset the offensive odor caused by livestock.

Court of appeals cuts 1 year off Joslin's guilty sentence

BOISE — The Idaho Court of Appeals on Thursday cut a year off the sentence Daniel Joslin must serve in prison for a Gooding County forger case.

Fifth District Judge Phillip Becker ordered Joslin to serve a 3.5-year term after admitting stealing a check from a cow-walker and cashing a forged \$150 check.

Since Becker did not list the criteria he used for the sentence, the court said its own review indicated a minimum of two years, with three years indeterminate afterward, would meet sentencing goals.

Counties in Magic Valley differ on handling abused

TWIN FALLS — Counties in the Magic Valley vary widely on how they handle reported cases of child sexual abuse, according to a study conducted by the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare.

Blaine County uses a multidisciplinary team, consisting of representatives from law enforcement, the prosecutor's office and Health and Welfare, to investigate child sexual abuse cases and decide on the best way to handle them, according to the report.

Blaine also has a protocol, a written agreement intended to make sure all parties in the investigation follow the proper steps, the report said.

Jerome County is close to implementing a similar protocol, and Twin Falls and Gooding counties have started developing

them, said Anne McNevin, family and children's services program manager for Region V, which covers the Magic Valley.

"I would like each county to have a protocol that outlines how each of us does business," McNevin said.

According to the study, in counties with fully developed multidisciplinary teams, relatively few cases of possible abuse are reported to Health and Welfare are found to be true.

However, of those cases, nearly all are referred for prosecution — an average of 99 percent, compared with an average of 67 percent for counties without such teams.

Blaine County differed from those averages. Between July 1, 1989 and June 30, 1990, nine cases were reported to Health and Welfare and seven were substantiated. However, of the four cases

A report is "substantiated" if an Idaho Department of Health and Welfare social worker believes there's enough evidence to indicate the complaint is probably true. Substantiated reports may be referred directly to prosecutors or to local law enforcement agencies for further investigation. The prosecutor decides whether to file criminal charges, apply for a child protection order, which requires a lower standard of proof, or do nothing.

Prosecutors may also receive child sexual abuse cases from sources other than Health and Welfare.

Emergency levy gets OK from board in Kimberly

KIMBERLY — The Kimberly School Board approved a \$37,000 emergency levy Thursday as a way to meet the added cost of an influx of new students.

School enrollment leaped 28 students this year, in some ways, took the board off-guard, according to Superintendent John Garner.

"By law, the board does not need voter approval to pass an emergency levy when school enrollment rises steeply.

The levy was for the maximum limit allowed by Idaho law.

That action could result in an increase in taxes for property owners in the Kimberly School District. Garner said he figured residents would pay an additional \$24 a year or \$2 a month on a house assessed for property tax purposes at \$60,000 and land at \$10,000.

It's unlikely, Garner said, that the levy will have no effect on taxes.

He said the Twin Falls County commissioners could extend the Kimberly School District the additional money out of a pool of property tax funds.

"But realistically, everyone's budget is tight," Garner said.

Garner added the decision was not an emergency.

"I wrote the board a memo in which I said we need the money," Garner said. "But politically, is this the right time?"

"The schools are real needy. People don't realize that," he said.

"It was interesting. Three board members said they didn't know they'd vote coming in. The discussion was quite good. They must have talked an hour on the issue.

The new students were in various grades, though not in kindergarten, Garner said.

"Our enrollment has vanished in kindergarten," he said. "We went from 114 last year to 68 this year."

The additional taxpayer funds will go toward desks, books and materials for the classrooms. He said of the total \$37,000 will be used for heating and cooling work at the high school.

One resident attended the meeting.

The board last approved an emergency levy two years ago.

Airport reprimands pilot of M-K plane

HAILEY — New signs will be posted at Friedman Memorial Airport to caution pilots against making any more noise than necessary while warming up their planes.

The signs were authorized after an incident involving complaints over excessive noise emitted from a corporate jet owned by Morrison Knudsen Corp.

Complaints on Aug. 22, from several nearby residents prompted the airport staff to send a letter to Morrison Knudsen Corp. in Boise asking them to limit the time they use their auxiliary power units, or APUs, in their pre-flight preparations.

The request was not taken lightly.

In a letter of reply from J. Patrick Moore, director of Corporate Aviation for Morrison Knudsen, Moore called the Friedman Airport request, "not only petty but an insult and in poor taste."

Moore's letter stated that the August flight of the company's Falcon 900 N91MK was scheduled to leave at 7 p.m.

carrying the Chairman of Morrison Knudsen, who was attending a business-related function associated with the Danny Thompson double check Memorial Golf Tournament.

Moore said the "noise" was late that evening, and the plane departed at 8:30 p.m. rather than 7 p.m. The APU had been in operation the entire time.

Wayne Werner of Sun Valley Aviation said the original letter was an over-reaction and out of time, especially since the APU was in operation during normal working hours.

He said he knows of no other airport in the world which restricts APU usage.

Some members of the Blaine County Airport Commission doubted the ability to restrict APU usage other than advising pilots to limit the time they are used.

Depending upon the type of aircraft it takes between 15 and 30 minutes to run the APU during pre-flight operations.

Signs will be placed on the interior and exterior of Sun Valley Aviation to gain voluntary pilot compliance.

In other airport business at Tuesday's meeting:

Sept. 2, 1991 was the busiest day at Friedman since the air traffic control tower was built. A record 633 operations were recorded for that day.

Air traffic "tap" this summer with more than 10,000 operations for August, as compared with 9,000 for August last year.

A trailer house donated to the airport by the U.S. Forest Service will remain unused for now. The commission would like to utilize the trailer for a pilot lounge near the T-hungar section, but lack sufficient funds to renovate and maintain the building at this time.

A bid was awarded to Shotwells, Inc. of Twin Falls to install a new lightning system on the runways. Out of a field of six bidders, Shotwells came in with the low bid of \$194,024. The highest bid was \$326,000.

The work on the project will begin in late September. Work will be done between the hours of 14:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.

The budget for district court increased 26 percent, while the general fund budget increased 38 percent for a total of \$1.1 million.

The general fund, the 2nd-largest line item ahead of the jail and bridge department - saw a large increase partially due to \$140,000 set aside for purchase of property to build a new jail.

The county's contingency account increased by \$100,000 this year, now totaling \$185,000.

County Administrative Assistant Chuck Corwin said the high cost of prosecuting Odaga - an estimated \$250,000 - has partially been absorbed in last year's budget with some additional funds coming from this year's budget.

While 11 departments had budget increases above 10 percent, 10 other departments saw budget decreases.

Departments which saw budget cuts include the treasurer, public defender, coroner, nursing home, county fair, elections, data processing, weed control, the courthouse and the judicial building.

The budget to operate Friedman Memorial Airport is unchanged, although the county, although no county tax funds are contributed. The airport is self-supporting from user revenues and federal grants.

The airport budget increased nearly 13 percent to \$752,351. This includes additional expenses for personnel, overtime, maintenance and miscellaneous expenses.

Both the county's general budget and the budget for the ambulance district were heard during a public hearing this past Tuesday, in which little public comment was given. The commissioners are expected to review and adopt the budgets at their next meeting Sept. 9.

The sheriff's budget increased 14 percent to \$678,000 and includes the hiring of an additional

Jerome City Council votes to annex land

JEROME - Jerome City Council members voted this week to annex 20 acres - and plan on stretching the city limits even more in the future.

Acreage occupied by the city wastewater treatment plant was officially annexed into the city, although Council President Don Jacobson said the legal description in the annexation ordinance was in error.

Moving a canal several years ago would require a change to the legal description, he said. The treatment plant property covers about 60 acres, but the council annexed only the portion occupied by the plant because the rest of the property was being farmed, Mayor Gerald Oster said.

The council also is looking at annexing 23 acres of school-owned property on the northwest edge of Jerome. The council heard the second of three readings of the ordinance that will finalize the annexation process. The city would be responsible for maintenance of the road after the school district had completed construction.

Jacobson asked that the ordinance contain a clause addressing the school district's responsibility for constructing a road from the end of East 10th street to the one-mile road.

Oster did not agree.

"I can't understand why you want it in there when it's already there (in the zoning ordinance)," he said.

Jacobson said requirements for road construction are in the zoning ordinance for a subdivision, adding this construction is not in a subdivision.

The mayor directed City Administrator Larry Paine to "add what's already in the zoning ordinance."

The annexation ordinance will be up for its final review and approval at the Sept. 16 council meeting.

In other business, the council will consider an appeal for a zoning variance submitted by Ralph J. Piper to build a airport beside his home.

"I need the car as close to the house as I can get it. My wife suffered a stroke and has diabetes; so sometimes I need to rush her to the hospital," Piper said. Piper added he had driven around town and found other carports that did not meet city regulations.

Unanimously approved the 1991-1992 budget for a total of \$6.7 million, a four percent increase in general funds instead of the five percent allowed by law.

Adopted a resolution proclaiming a special bond election to be held Sept. 17.

The city is asking the citizens to vote on a \$1.5 million revenue bond issue to make improvements of the city's sanitary sewage collection and treatment system. The bonds would be paid off in twenty years or less from user fees paid by the Jerome Cheese Co. plant to be constructed and put into operation next year.

Voting will take place at the city library for registered voters living north of Main Street and at city hall for those living south of Main Street.

Appointed an election judge, clerks and registrars.

Unanimously approved a resolution for environmental review to ensure development projects in the Industrial Park south of Jerome would not adversely impact the area.

Approved a revised resolution that allows hiring of city police personnel above the entry level of pay based on qualifications and experience. The resolution came about after the city administrator endorsed the hiring as being in accordance

with city regulations and the council approved a specific salary.

Authorized a \$2,900 payment to Jim Stauffer whose crops had to be relocated to make room for the new road being constructed south of the Industrial Park.

Heard a report that a water main had been broken during the one-mile

south road construction and there was a possibility that other water lines could be severed. The line had been laid on solid rock, and heavy equipment had crushed the pipes, although there were three feet of soil above the pipelines.

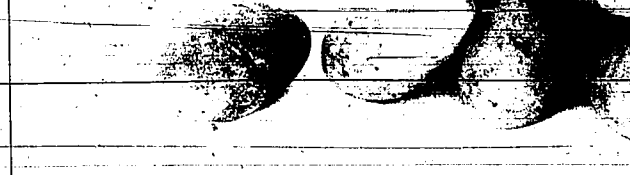

Water proposal stirs little interest

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A state plan to protect stretches of the world-famous Henry's Fork of the Snake River received a decidedly low-key response at a hearing here. Only a dozen people attended a meeting on a proposal that would restrict hydroelectric development, stream bed activities and mining on about 100 miles of the Henry's Fork and other streams. A similar session was held in Rexburg Thursday and another is planned in Ashton Tuesday evening. One local white water enthusiast,

and hotly debated by the 1991 Idaho Legislature before being approved. One water board member doubts the Henry's Fork plan will stir up so much controversy. "There's nothing controversial here. There's no big project in this area so far," said Chairman Dave Rydahl, St. Anthony. The first draft of the Henry's Fork plan would protect nearly 60 miles of the Henry's Fork, and portions of the Buffalo River, Warm River, Falls River and Bluff Creek.

Work on Moscow fisheries halted by chlorine levels

MOSCOW (AP) — The deaths of some 4,000 chinook salmon last brought research to a temporary halt at the fisheries laboratory in the University of Idaho's College of Forestry, Wildlife and Range Sciences. Elevated chlorine levels in the lab's water were blamed. "We're in a precarious state," Christine Moffitt, an associate

professor at the college, said Wednesday. "We can't do any experiments because we don't have a reliable water supply." The Fisheries Lab was hooked up to Moscow's city water system for three weeks until Wednesday. The city's water contains about five times as much chlorine as the university's.

Firm will design juvenile center

POGATELLO (AP) — The Pocatello architectural firm Wallace-Hudson and Associates will design a 12-bed, \$923,000 juvenile detention center that will serve seven southeastern Idaho counties. Wallace-Hudson was chosen from four firms that submitted proposals. Bannock County Commissioner Val Arvas said Wednesday during regional county commissioner meeting. The center will be funded by a state grant.

Horse's death baffles investigators

DONNELLY (AP) — Valley County authorities are puzzled by the bizarre death of a horse found mutilated in a pasture near Donnelly. The 14-year-old mare was found last Friday lying on its side. All of its blood had been drained. The animal's neck and tibia had been cut cleanly. No drops of blood or tracks were found around the carcass and there were no signs of gunshot wounds, Valley County Sheriff's Detective Tommy Rhea said.

The horse, owned by Eva Patterson of Boise, was found near the Gold Fork River, southeast of Donnelly. Patterson said the animal was last seen alive Aug. 28. "We consider this serious," Rhea said. "We have got a very suspicious event here in Valley County, and it's being investigated from every direction." Rhea said there were no suspects. The incident is the latest in a series of animal mutilations in Idaho, across the country and in other parts

of the world, said Linda Moulton Howe, a former Boise resident, who has investigated the subject for 11 years. An estimated 1,500 cases have been reported in Idaho alone since 1973. "This sounds like a classic mutilation," Howe said of the Donnelly incident during a telephone interview Wednesday. Howe, who has produced an Emmy-winning documentary on the topic, said there also have been recent reports of animal mutilations.

Waste from lab found in forest

BOISE (AP) — State and federal drug authorities are investigating illegal drug laboratory waste found in the Boise National Forest. "It was bags of garbage, basically hauled from the road," Frank Carroll, Boise National Forest spokesman, said Wednesday. "The chemicals and equipment (were) associated with methamphetamine drug production." Carroll said the recovered waste hadn't damaged water or soil quality because it was in plastic when found Saturday. The plastic sacks were found at the base of a 300- to 400-foot cliff below Idaho Highway 21 by a Forest Service timber-marking crew. Rubber gloves, rubber tubing and plastic bottles for distilled water and alcohol also were found.

Girl drowns in canal

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A 20-month-old Idaho Falls girl has drowned in an irrigation canal here. Idaho Falls police said Sarah Joana Rix, daughter of Janya and Greg Rix, was pronounced dead at Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center Wednesday night. The girl's mother told police her daughter Hilary, 3, came to her at about 6 p.m. and told her Sarah had fallen into a canal and floated away.

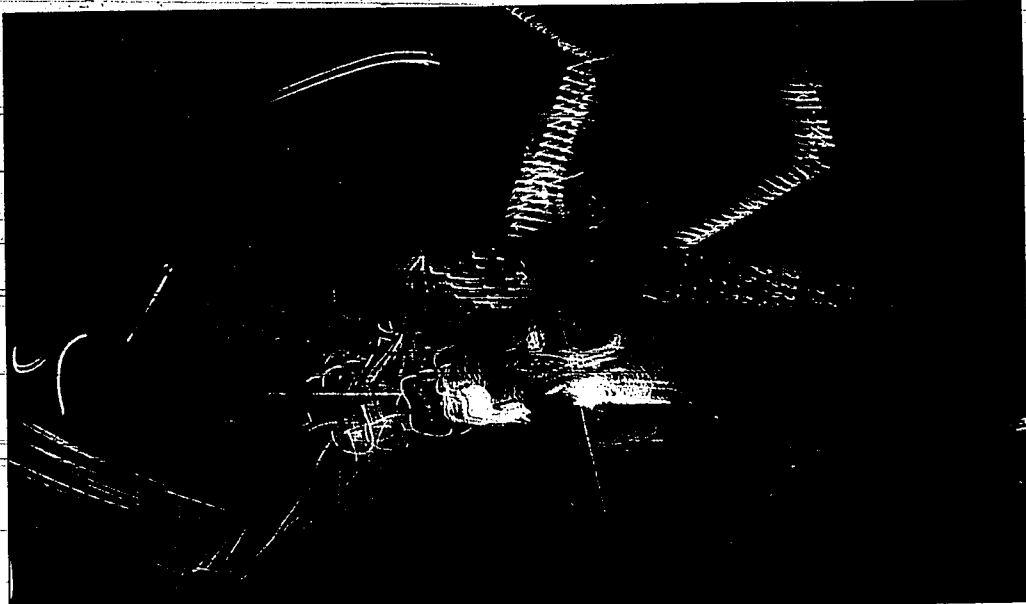

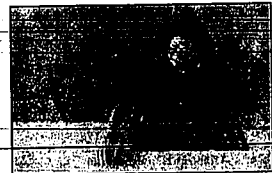
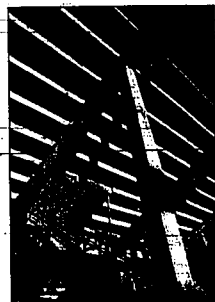

It seems they accidentally interrupted the bank's evil CEO (Tom Sizemore) in his drug smuggling activities. The performances are as bad as the script. The wisecracking Mickeyourke is so wonderful at being the wisecracking Mickey Rourke that even De Niro couldn't top him any better — but who cares? As for Don — Johnson — the only way I've ever been able to tell him apart from the equally good-looking Mark Harmon is that Johnson's an even worse actor.

For many filmgoers, Frank Capra's scripts, values made their lives wonderful

A few days before Frank Capra's death at 94 this week, I spoke with a writer-director friend in Hollywood who was finishing a film script he could only describe as "Capraesque." A tough job, I told him, for though it is easy to plot out a parody, to imitate the point outlines of a movie directed by Frank Capra — it is hard to infuse it with the emotional force that the man himself put into his best work. The quintessential Capra film, "It's a Wonderful Life," is now more than 40 years old, its story of a man who miraculously learns the value of life now so familiar through so many repeat showings on TV that it would seem to be all but unwatchable. Yet it remains a seasonal classic, our American "A Christmas Carol," and when its battered hero finally stands amid family and friends, weep-

ing with happiness and singing with quavering voice the sentimental "Auld Lang Syne," is re-entry into an ideal world of loved ones can still bring tears to the eyes of viewers who have seen the movie dozens of times. Many of the small-town values Capra exalted in such stories as "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington" and "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town" are lumped in our nation's history; perhaps they never even existed with quite the rose hue Capra put on them. But now, as then, we liked to believe they were part of our heritage, and we still honor the themes of proud individualism and individual integrity that he proclaimed. This, plus a sharp sense of comic character, made Capra's early days as a gagman for silent comedian Harry Langdon, made him a popular favorite and guaranteed him movies a box-office success. He was a natural to direct the "Why We Fight" propaganda films of

World War II, for by then he had already made a string of dramas that had come to represent the hope and glory of American democracy. They were films in which the unphilosophical little man, usually played by such scenographic heroes as Jimmy Stewart or Gary Cooper, eventually went out over the machinations of the clever, corrupt fat cats of this world who had deceived him. Before his eventual triumph, the hero would have his resolve tested as he was brought down to humiliating wear-down by overwhelming odds. But eventually, with the aid of chance and the last-minute rallying of good folks around him, he would come out on top, his faith in family and country reaffirmed. This kind of movie was not just an exercise in storytelling for Capra. It was a dramatization of his faith in the enduring values of this country, and because his movies had behind them their creator's own strong feelings

about the wonders of America, they had a consistency of style and a believability in story that simply cannot be repeated, no matter how faithfully one follows the letter of his intentions. Capra was not unaware of flaws in his little people. He satirized the small-mindedness of the ignorant held in many of his films; but, having noted these shortcomings, he returned to the simple, small-town values he consistently upheld because he truly believed they were the foundation of the country's strength. He took these values to their extreme when he transported them to the eerie Shangri-La of "Lost Horizon." Here, in this exotic and expensively designed world of harmony and youth, they seemed odd, ill-fated, phony. Only when they were grounded in the humble, immediate world of the American that Capra envisioned did such ideals seem real, practical, palpable.

When our own faith in our ideals began to waver, in the aftermath of World War II, Capra's movies weakened too. He left moviemaking in 1964 with "Paper Moon," an inferior remake of his 1933 "Lady for a Day." Life was not as simple then as it had seemed in his prime, and he was starting to lose the fierce energy that had shaped every aspect of his films in the '30s and '40s. Perhaps it is our nostalgia for what

we view as a less complex, more loving world that draws us to those old Capra movies again and again. Jimmy Stewart, nearly dead from exhaustion, fighting the good fight alone in the U.S. Senate; Gary Cooper, pumping away on his tuba in the small-town band that has come to cheer him on his way; Stewart, again, hugging his faithful wife and their adorable children underneath the Christmas tree.

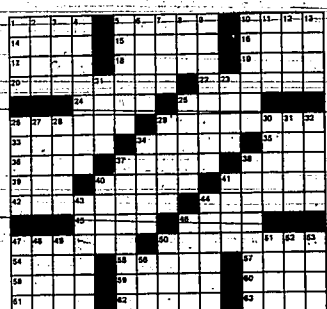

THE ACES ON BRIDGE

"Extreme fear can neither fight nor fly."
— Shakespeare.

"I was afraid that dummy's diamonds would give him enough diamonds for him to make his slam," confessed a downcast West. "I had an easy answer to the problem, but I allowed fear to override my thoughts."
South took the "practical" finesse in hearts and ruffed when East covered. South drew trumps in two rounds, discarded a low club on dummy's heart ace, and led a low diamond back to his jack and West's ace. Fearing the imposing diamond suit-in-dummy, West shifted to a club, murmuring, "It's now or never, partner."
It turned out to be never. South won his club jack and ended the play, claiming the rest of the tricks.

Now should West have known that he should wait for his trick in clubs, in spite of dummy's diamonds?
The play revealed that South had started with five spades and no hearts. Therefore, he held eight hearts in clubs and diamonds. Even if South held the club ace, when left to his own devices he could win only 11 tricks (five spades, one heart, four diamonds and a club).
After winning the diamond ace (it would be disastrous to duck), West should exit safely in diamonds. Sooner or later South would have to try the club finesse, and instead of paying off to a slam, West would collect 100 points.

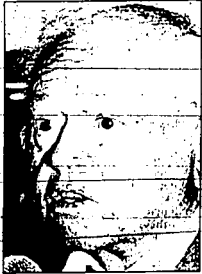
Q: Isn't Sylvester Stallone in a funk because no one wants to see him in anything but action movies like "Rocky" and "Rambo"? — D.F.

Need a few laughs this September? Take a look at "Days of Our Lives." Dear Dierdre Hall is back as Marlana after flying off to oblivion, meaning prime time, several years ago.

Trying to explain Marlana's return is easy compared to the problem of bringing back Wayne Northrop as Marlana's old love Roman Brady. When Dierdre left, Northrop also took a powder. Actor Drake Hogestyn quickly stepped into Northrop's shoes as Roman. And 6'4" Robert Mailhouse signed on last fall as Hogestyn's bumbling detective Brian Scofield.

Now Mailhouse, or Scofield, has a problem. Is his boss Roman I or Roman II? Deirdre Hall's Marlana has the same dilemma. Just which

Roman is she in love with? It will take weeks to find out. None of these characters are highly perceptive.

Thinking Detective Scofield might offer clues, we talked to Robert Mailhouse. His Detective Scofield is the only comedian in the afternoon at the moment. If Scofield doesn't have a clue, perhaps his show dog, Fluffy, might be of help.

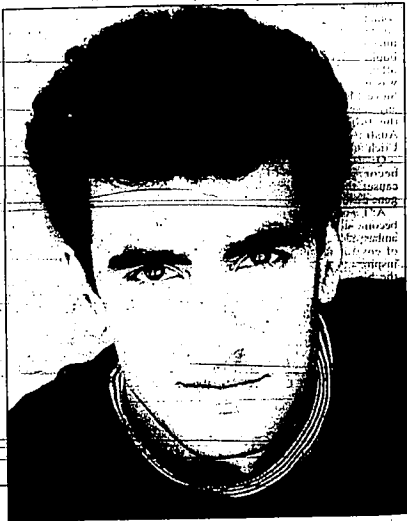
Mailhouse is not about to give anything away. His game is simple. Everybody else on the soap is deadly serious, so Robert plays the joker.

Originally Mailhouse was a day player, a temporary to fill a void left by Abe Carver (James Remolds), Roman's original sidekick. Deciding to keep Mailhouse around, boss Al Rabin encouraged the newconfirer to play for laughs.

Apart from his Columbo act, Mailhouse likes props and has watched enough comedians to know that keeping your hands busy doesn't hurt. Scofield on camera usually has something going so his arms aren't just dangling. With his size he commands attention; and the actor isn't about to waste this advantage.

If Mailhouse runs out of moves, there's always Fluffy, the dog, to lean on. It turns out Fluffy is played by four canines, one who stars on

the side as Rin Tin Tin in the Canadian series. "He's very professional," says Robert, "and has good breath. That's quite important."

Good for Mailhouse. He should be writing scripts for the show when not on camera.

The important thing is not to go too far with this comedy routine on serious "Days." Maintain balance, and a weekly pay check. Mailhouse is having a good time on the soap, perhaps keeping his true thoughts to himself. "Hey," he says, "Days' is back. Number three in the ratings. The stories are exciting again. The show is out of the doldrums."

Shopping channel launches Infonet

NEW YORK (AP) — Infonet, a 24-hour network devoted exclusively to infomercials, will start beaming program-length commercials nationwide on Labor Day, executives of Home Shopping Network Inc. said Monday.

"We are taking this art form to a new level," said Earl D. Greenburg, president of HSN Infonet, Inc., and HSN Entertainment, Inc., in announcing the new service, which has the slogan, "... where the infomercial comes of age."

Home Shopping Network Inc. generates 96 hours of live programming daily for its three Home Shopping Club electronic retail sales networks.

Infonet, based at its St. Petersburg, Fla., headquarters, will license existing infomercials and produce its own for an industry that has generated an estimated \$1 billion in advertising revenues in the past two years.

"Infonet is just a logical extension," Greenburg said. "It's just a 30-minute form of

what we've been doing in short form every day."

"We'll be in full operation with 48 half-hours of programming on Sept. 1, with original programming the second week, and lots of new half-hour shows in the third week," he said.

During that month, he said, HSN's cable and broadcast divisions will be "actively and aggressively" seeking affiliations throughout the country.

Initially, Infonet will be available to 4 million to 5 million U.S. households, including satellite, cable and broadcast affiliates, but HSN executives expect the service to grow rapidly.

"We will be entering Europe in the next few weeks with the Home Shopping Network Entertainment infomercials," Greenburg said.

Cable and broadcast programmers who affiliate will be able to dedicate an entire channel to the service, broadcast any portion live, "cherry pick" any segment for delayed broadcast, or order prerecorded seg-

ments. Channels that air Infonet will receive a commission based on the quantity of products sold, said Robert T. Sutton, president of Home Shopping Network Inc.

Demand for conventional TV ads is down, which makes infomercials attractive to TV stations.

"The reverse is true in a healthy ad market," said John Rohr, analyst for the Blair Television station representatives.

"When the market turns around, there is far greater demand for conventional advertising than there is for long-form infomercials," Rohr said. "So the demand for those things will disappear."

Advertising agencies, however, may see Infonet as a way to target people who are in the marketplace to buy, Rohr said.

Home Shopping Network began in 1982 as a local cable service in the Tampa, Fla., region and began nationwide transmission in 1985.

In 1990, it reported more than \$1 billion in retail sales.

Clayton Moore 1st hit western scene as 'Hopalong Cassidy,' not 'Lone Ranger'

Q. Was "The Lone Ranger" the first TV western serial? Did Clayton Moore ever star in anything else? I can remember him only as the Lone Ranger. — P.L., Los Alamitos, Calif.

A. "Ranger" was the first western serial produced for television. It bowed in prime time on ABC Sept. 15, 1949. But William Boyd's "Hopalong Cassidy" was seen on New York TV as early as 1945 and became a local series in 1948. On June 24, 1949, it bowed as an NBC series.

But those were all edited versions of Boyd's old theatrical movies with new narration and a few added scenes. It wasn't until 1951 that Boyd made shows for TV.

Moore started in the movies in 1939, did various roles until he left for service in 1943. He went into westerns and serials in 1946 working for several studios but, after 1949, when he did his first Lone Ranger, he never did another role.

Q. Tell me about Wanda in "Doogie Howser, M.D." What's her real name and where can I write her? — F.D., Lapeer, Mich.

A. Lisa Dean Ryan, is 18, born in Los Angeles, started acting professionally in high school, doing TV and commercials. She's been in "America's Most Wanted," "A Year in the Life," "21 Jump Street." Write: 20th Century Fox, Box 900, Beverly Hills, Calif. 90213.

Q. Where can I write the "Home" program on ABC mornings? With their new format, they've managed to ruin one of the best programs and the most interesting. I hear Gary Collins may be going and he's the best. I can't warm up to Beth Rybak. I don't tune in anymore. — D.M., Lorain, Ohio.

A. ABC figured 1990s homemakers weren't interested in homey subjects and switched to a more newsy format. So far Collins is hanging in there but there have been rumbles about his departure.

Harmon was born Sept. 2, 1951, in Los Angeles, Calif., son of the late football star Tom Harmon and former movie starlet Elyse Knox. He was a star quarterback at UCLA, started acting in college.

He made his TV debut in "Ozzie's Girls" (sister Kristen was married to Rick Nelson, son of Ozzie Nelson). He has a 1977 Emmy nomination for "Eleanor and Franklin: The White House Years." After leaving "St. Elsewhere," he concentrated on TV movies, among them "Dillinger," "Long Road Home," "Shadow of a Doubt." He's married to Pam Dawber and father of Sean. **Q: Whatever happened to the actor who played Little Luke McCoy on "The Real McCoys"?** — C.J.S., DePere, Wis.

A. Michael Winkelman was Little Luke. He left the show in 1962, the year before the series ended. There are no credits for him since.

Q. For years I have been trying to find out the name of the music on "Highway to Heaven." Tell me the

name of this song and where I can buy the record. — S.P., Rochester Hills, Mich.

A. David Rose wrote the original music for the series, seen 1984-89. The theme has no special name and it hasn't been recorded, according to NBC.

Q. What was the full name of Topper on the old TV show of the same name? My husband says it was William; I say it was Cosmo. We know Leo G. Carroll played the role. — G.B., Gastonia, N.C.

A. It was Cosmo from Thorne Smith's original story through the 1937 movie, two sequels, the TV series and the 1979 TV movie. Roland Young played Cosmo Topper in the early features. Jack Warden in the TV movie.

Q. My family and I enjoy "In Living Color" very much. We wonder who plays Homey the clown. — A.C., Brighton, Mich.

A. Damon Wayans is Homey. He's also critic Blaine; Whiz, co-host of the Homeboy Shopping Network; Anton, the homeless man, and many others on the show.

ABC to air gulf war drama

NEW YORK (AP)— ABC said Monday it plans to broadcast a two-hour drama about the Persian Gulf War, with actors playing U.S. servicemen and women singled out for valor during the battle to oust Iraq from Kuwait.

"Heroes of the Desert Storm," scheduled for Oct. 6, is the first network drama about the U.S.-led allied war with Iraq and will combine documentary combat footage with scenes staged at U.S. military installations.

The show was produced with Pentagon cooperation. The technical advisor is retired Army Lt. Gen. Thomas E. Kelley, former operations director for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the officer who conducted daily Pentagon press briefings during the Gulf War.

NBC, Newsweek present special reports on cities

NEW YORK (AP) — NBC News and Newsweek magazine next week will present parallel special reports on the problems of America's cities, the network said Tuesday.

Both will use the results of an NBC-Newsweek poll on cities.

But NBC and Newsweek aren't sharing material gathered by their reporters, NBC spokeswoman Peggy Hubble said.

NBC's reports, called "City Limits," will appear during the network's regularly scheduled news programs, from "Today" to the "NBC Nightly News."

They will start Sept. 1 on "Sunday Today."

Newsweek's Sept. 9 issue will have a special section on the subject.

The magazine's issue goes on sale Monday.

ABC, in a similar venture with Time magazine, has done three news specials on subjects featured in Time magazine the same week.

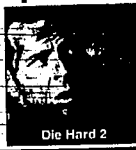
