Nuclear waste scrap bound for courts

BOISE — The Energy Department notified the Andrus administration late Thursday that it has no intention of obtaining a state air quality permit before the governor has demanded before shipping up to 300 tons of high-level radioactive waste to Idaho for storage.

"We anticipated that's what they would say," Gov. Cecil Andrus said after reviewing the notification from Augustine Pitrolo, Idaho operations manager for the department.

"And the attorney general will be at the courthouse tomorrow to ask for an injunction until they comply with state law," the governor declared. "We will not stand by and let them make Idaho the nation's nuclear waste dump."

Andrus said the Bush administration had already been notified of the state's plans to

return to court on Friday in its continuing effort to stop shipment of the high-level waste from the Public Service Co. of Colorado's decommissioned Fort St. Vrain reactor near Denver to the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory near Idaho Falls.

A spokesman for the governor said the Justice Department said it would immediately ask that the case be moved to federal courts, where the Energy Department and the Colorado utility have defeated two previous Andrus attempts to halt the waste shipments.

Following the last decision from the 9th

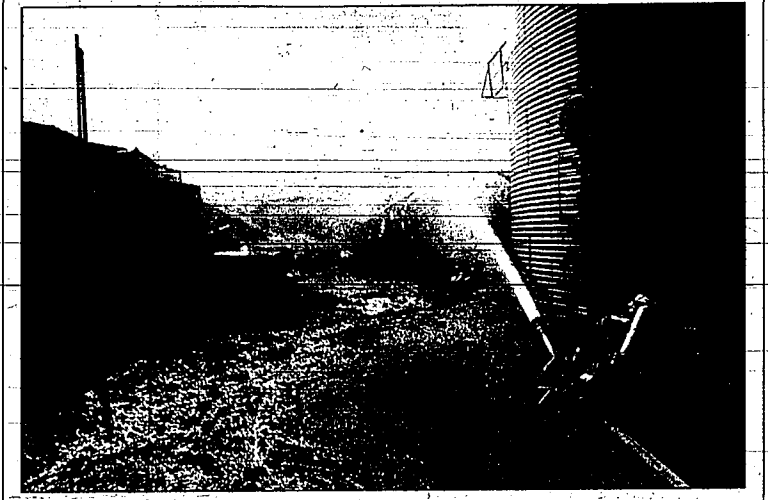
U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals on Sept. 20, the utility notified Idaho officials that it would be the first of more than 200 truck shipments of the waste soon. The exact date is confidential under federal law.

In his letter to Andrus, Pitrolo disputed state environmental claims that the Energy Department acknowledged that storing the additional waste at INEL would increase air pollution and that new facilities would have to be built to hold all the additional waste.

But Pitrolo also said the existing storage

Picabo grain elevator fire forces evacuation

PICABO — Flames continued to eat slowly at the remains of the Silver Creek grain elevator Thursday as Picabo's 50 residents watched and remembered the fiery night before.

"There were flames going up, oh, maybe 200 feet" from the five-story elevator Wednesday night, said Tina Hyde of Picabo.

"There were quite a few big explosions," she said.

The cause of those explosions and the fire in this south-central Blaine County hamlet remained a mystery, investigators said Thursday.

Hyde and many of her neighbors were evacuated by firefighters worried about pesticides and other chemicals that may have mixed with the smoke.

"I got my horses and went to Carey to

CIA reports not slanted, Gates states

WASHINGTON — Robert Gates, seeking to quell a rebellion against his nomination as CIA director, denied on Thursday that he had slanted intelligence reports for political gain but acknowledged "I have to be more sensitive" to underlings.

Gates reappeared before the Senate Intelligence Committee in the wake of testimony from former and current CIA analysts that, as a high-ranking deputy, he had tailored information to "pander to his bosses' anti-Soviet views" and that he harshly suppressed dissent.



"I've watched and listened and read with some dismay, as well as anger" the proceedings of recent days, said Gates, who joined the CIA in 1966 and rose to become its acting director for a brief time in 1987.

The crowded hearing room was still as Gates, 48, presented the case on which his nomination might hinge — just two weeks earlier in his first appearance, he seemed to enjoy near-solid bipartisan support, but several senators appeared to be wavering after hearing the latest criticism.

"You're not the right man at this particular time," Sen. Ernest Hollings, D-S.C., told Gates at the end of the day, saying he would not vote for him.

Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., considered an influential voice, said "the committee vote will be pretty close, one way or the other." Nunn said he had started out supporting Gates but now "I guess I'm in neutral."

In a methodical way, Gates — a trained analyst of Soviet affairs — listed 20 allegations and sought to disprove them. He noted that most of the criticism emanated from the CIA office which dealt in Soviet activities in the Third World.

Sen. J. Bennett Johnston, D-La., said he had until 1985, was the most outspoken of three former CIA officials who criticized Gates in testimony Wednesday. In addition, the committee released sworn statements from three current analysts, echoing the same theme, as Gates appeared Thursday. One said the "vast majority" of analysts and managers at the agency believed Gates "subverted the intelligence process."

Among the critics' allegations was that Gates, seeking to impose his own views and those of his late boss, William Casey, systematically slanted analyses to reflect a far greater Soviet role in the Third World — including Iran, Afghanistan and Nicaragua — than was the case.

Gates cited examples to the contrary, and said he had always encouraged analysts — even junior ones — to present other points of views.

He traced some of the rancor against him to his personality and style. He told the panel that three days after taking over the CIA analysis operation in 1982, he told analysts much of their product reflected "complacent thinking" and "arrogance."

Drug use by teen-agers declining, poll finds

WASHINGTON — Use of illegal drugs by teen-agers dramatically declined over the past five years, a study by a private group has found.

The percentage of teen-agers ages 13 to 17 who said they had used marijuana in the previous year dropped by almost 30 percent, while those who said they had used cocaine fell by more than 52 percent and crack cocaine almost 47 percent, said the Partnership for a Drug-Free America's Attitude Tracking Study.

And although the number of teen-agers who said they planned to use drugs in the

next year also declined, a significant percentage still said they planned to use them at least once. Eighteen percent said they would try marijuana, 5 percent cocaine and 3.4 percent crack, the survey said.

Fewer younger teens appeared to be trying drugs at all.

The percentage of 13 year olds who said they had tried marijuana dropped by more than half, from 16.3 percent five years ago to 7.8 percent this year, the survey said. There was a 69 percent drop in the use of cocaine in that age group, from 8.4 percent to 2.6 percent, and a decrease from 4.7 percent to 2.3 percent for crack cocaine.

"These children have grown up hearing and seeing anti-drug messages in the media, in their classrooms and in their homes, and it's paying off," said James E. Burke, chairman of the partnership, a non-profit coalition of private advertising and media groups.

President Bush congratulated the coalition Thursday at a closed-door White House meeting with about 150 media and entertainment leaders.

"By contributing unprecedented media time and space to anti-drug messages, and by incorporating anti-drug themes ... you are changing attitudes and your efforts are paying off," Bush said.

Clinton pitches Demo candidacy to middle class

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Gov. Bill Clinton joined the field of Democratic presidential candidates on Thursday promising to reinvent government to protect a middle class he said President Bush ignores.

"We must turn this country around and get it working again. We've got to fight for middle-class Americans for a change," Clinton said in speech interrupted by applause more than 50 times.

Clinton is the fifth major Democratic candidate to join the race for the 1992 nomination. All the contenders cast the federal government as shortsighted and

gridlocked, blind to the middle class.

"The change I seek, and the change we must all seek, isn't liberal or conservative. It's different and both," Clinton said. "Out here, the people don't much care about the labels: left or right or liberal or conservative — all the other words that have made our politics a substitute for action."

Clinton, who made himself a standard-bearer for the moderate wing of the party in

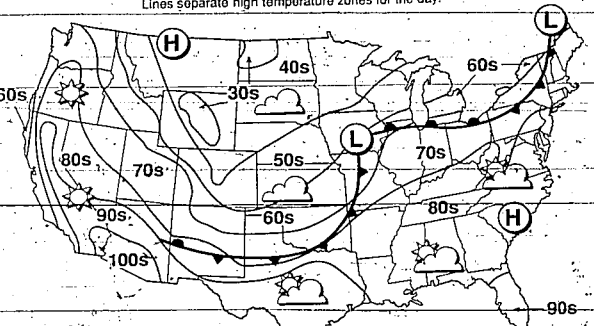

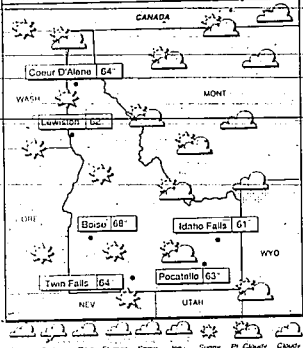

Weather summary

The National Weather Service says high pressure has stalled over the northwest and the Snake River Valley of southern Idaho.

The system was dry but cool, forecasters said. There were no reports of rainfall anywhere in the state. Temperatures likely were to be cooler tonight.

Gusty winds Thursday — 35 mph in the south to about 20 mph in the north — were blowing under sunny skies. Those winds kicked up dust in localized areas of the Magic Valley and late in the afternoon led to the closing of Interstate 84 between the Cottrell port of entry and the coldest at 20 degrees.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 75 degrees at Hagerman and Parma. Stanley and Dixie reported the coldest at 20 degrees.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the highest temperature was 111 degrees at Palm Springs, Calif. The lowest was 15 degrees at Wisdom, Mont.

Snow falls in parts of Montana; rain spatters East

Showers were scattered Thursday along the East Coast and thunderstorms developed along a cold front crossing the middle of the nation. Snow covered parts of Montana.

A cold front crossing the central states bumped up against hot air with temperatures in the 80s that extended across the southern Plains and the lower Mississippi Valley, creating the possibility of thunderstorms.

The cold front extended from south-central Kansas to northern Illinois at midday and a few showers and thunderstorms had developed over the southern half of Missouri.

Showers forming ahead of the cold front were scattered from Ohio to the lower Great Lakes, while behind the front showers spread over Iowa and eastern Nebraska, and rain and snow showers were over the northern Plains.

Late Wednesday, thunderstorms that developed along the front produced large hail, heavy rain and damaging wind from northeastern Kansas across northern Missouri to west-central Illinois.

Showers and thunderstorms associated with low pressure off the coast of North Carolina stretched along the northeastern North Carolina. Showers prevailed over the

middle Atlantic Coast and the southern coast of New England.

The naval air station at Norfolk, Va., received 1.31 inches of rain between 2 a.m. and 8 a.m. EDT, and morning showers produced about 1.75 inches of rain at Portsmouth, Va., the National Weather Service said.

Showers and thunderstorms associated with a stationary front extended across southern and central Florida.

Snow developed over Montana during the morning and heavy wet snow continued to fall during the early afternoon. Snow totals ranged up to 3 inches in the Great Falls area, with an inch reported at Cut Bank and Lewistown.

Behind the cold front, strong northerly wind fell cold air into the north-central part of the nation. Afternoon temperatures were generally below 60° over the northern Plains and the upper Mississippi Valley, with readings in the 30s and 40s in eastern Montana and northeastern Wyoming, and in the northern Rockies.

Lows early Thursday dropped into the upper 20s and 30s along the Continental Divide, including 25 at Gallup, N.M., and in the northern Plains, the upper Mississippi Valley and the Great Basin.

Energy Department set to ship atomic wastes to New Mexico

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Energy Department assumed control Thursday of a tract of federal land near Carlsbad for a controversial atomic waste storage facility.

A spokesman for the Energy Department said a bin of waste is ready and could be shipped in a week. But New Mexico Attorney General Tom Udall promised to file suit to prevent the waste from entering the state.

Energy Secretary James Watkins received permission from the Interior Department for the land transfer late Thursday after day-long, last-minute negotiations broke down over an alternative plan being drafted in Congress.

The land transfer was needed before the department could begin a five-year test program at the underground storage facility known as the Waste Isolation Pilot Project, or WIPP, 26 miles southeast of Carlsbad.

The department plans to ship as many as 8,500 drums of plutonium-contaminated wastes to the underground disposal site from federal weapons production facilities to determine whether the site is suitable for permanent use.

Energy Department spokesman Fred Lash said the state on Thursday was given the required seven-day notice before waste shipments can proceed.

The latest confrontation with the federal government came just hours after the Democratic chief executive urged the state's two Republican U.S. Senators to use their influence with the White House to help him keep the waste out of the state.

"Our finding issue with me and get in there and help us," the governor said in a message aimed at Republicans Larry Craig and Steve Symms.

"The challenge came in the taping of the 'Newpoint' program to be aired on Sunday."

Symms spokesman Dave Pearson said the senator would like to help but "He hasn't asked us for help. Steve Symms is more than willing to listen to an appeal for help or advice on INEL or any other facility."

Craig offered to help the state negotiate with the Bush administration.

"Now that the governor has lost his lawsuit with the federal government, maybe he would again accept my offer to come to the table with me to arrive at an agreement on how to handle this waste," Craig said, claiming Andrus "bolloed" during a similar session months ago and "told me straight to my face to butt out."

stay with my daughter," said Winnie Atwood, one of several Picabo residents who spent the night in Carey. Seven miles to the east, the built-in toxic smoke and the possibility of a fuel explosion turned out to be unfounded, and the people living along First Street began coming home Thursday morning.

What they saw was a billowing plume of black barley covered with the rubble from the grain elevator. Choking white smoke poured along the ground, borne by a west wind. Charred pieces of aluminum siding cracked and clattered as firefighters began mopping up.

Two metal grain bins were scorched but remained intact.

The owner of Silver Creek Supply, which includes the grain elevator and bins and the tiny community's general store, is Gordon Galt.

Galt said about 50,000 bushels of malt barley inside the elevator were destroyed, and another 16,000 to 18,000 bushels were likely damaged by the heat.

Eccles remained optimistic that 35,000 bushels in a third bin can be salvaged. He estimated the total damage could top half a million dollars.

Neither he nor the insurance adjusters will know for sure until they can get a good look at what's left. It may take until early next week before the area has cooled down enough to be safe, said Dan McKenna, chief of the Wood River Fire Protection District.

Workers used construction equipment Thursday to move piles of smoldering debris in where they could be watered down. McKenna said crews will work through the weekend.

Firefighters were called to the elevator at 9:22 p.m. Wednesday and found the structure engulfed in flames when they arrived, McKenna said.

U.S. Highway 20, which runs past the elevator, was closed about 9:30 p.m. and remained closed until noon Thursday.

Betty Eccles remembers seeing the fire in the distance as she drove toward Picabo Wednesday night.

"When I drove over here, I said 'It's gone,'" Betty Eccles said. The Eccles live two miles west of Picabo and they can see the elevator from home, but usually not after dark.

On Wednesday, however, flames shot as high as 200 feet above the elevator, lighting up the night sky.

About 45 firefighters from Bellevue, Hailey, Sun Valley and

elsewhere battled the flames through the night.

Once the fire became uncontrollable, firefighters concentrated on protecting the other grain bins and nearby homes. Because agricultural chemicals are commonly stored in the area, officials evacuated most of Picabo's residents in case the thick smoke turned into a toxic cloud.

Initial reports indicated that a propane tank and a fuel tank were

Hours of excitement, moments of terror

PICABO — An ordinary Wednesday night in this quiet Blaine County hamlet turned exciting in a hurry.

"It definitely got the heart racing fast," said Picabo resident Nicole Miller, who with this town's other 50 residents watched a landmark grain elevator explode in fire.

Miller and her roommate said they heard an explosion they thought was a sonic boom. Then they heard two more.

Stepping outside their house a block away from the elevator, Miller saw five-foot flames erupting from the 75-story structure.

"It was scary, really scary," Miller recalled.

The elevator and its contents of grain and coal went up in smoke Wednesday and early Thursday, forcing the evacuation of most residents of Picabo.

Investigators Thursday said they didn't know the cause of the fire, but the loss was estimated at \$500,000.

Miller and her roommate said neighbor Sharon Purdy's house was in danger from burning materials blown by the wind, so they went to help hose down the property.

"I was working in the kitchen when I heard the explosion and smelled the smoke," Purdy said.

Because Purdy's house has a metal roof and because she took the precaution of turning on the sprinklers, she said she never felt in immediate danger. But she admitted that the repeated explosions that spewed burning debris and cinders across her yard were a bit frightening.

For Brandon Fiecus and Tina Petersen, whose home lies immediately across the street

from the elevators, the evening's events were "kind of neat."

Both teen-agers raced to the main elevator building to try to get trucks and equipment out of the building.

"There were flames right overhead," Fiecus said.

"They were only successful in getting one loader out of the structure. A hystar that failed to start now lies in blackened ruin, alongside a flattened truck."

Blaine County Sheriff Deputy Dale Stocking's immediate reaction to the sight of the fire was "Oh, s---," as he came on the scene about 9:30 p.m. and saw flames shooting high into the breezy October night.

The roughly four dozen people who live in Picabo's 212 houses were evacuated before midnight. Most went to friends' or relatives' homes in Carey, Hailey or Bellevue, but the Carey School opened its doors-for those with no place to go.

After hearing the cacophony of sirens racing through town, Kiri Lang of Bellevue followed the ambulances and fire trucks to see what the commotion was all about.

State police blocked off U.S. Highway 20 west of Picabo and diverted traffic through Richfield, but Lang knew of a county road to take her into Picabo.

She rounded a corner in Gannett, said flames were visible eight miles to the southeast. The explosions were "really something to see," she said.

Lang returned to Picabo Thursday to see the remains of the landmark elevator that motorists have skirted for decades.

Lang, along with scores of other motorists and nearby residents, brought their cameras and camcorders to record the rubble that remained.

The damage and the grain will be covered by insurance, he said.

Alzheimer's may have genetic link

WASHINGTON — Researchers studying three generations of a family with Alzheimer's disease have isolated a mutated gene that may trigger one form of the brain disorder, giving new evidence that it can be passed from one generation to another.

Researchers at the Indiana University School of Medicine examined blood, tissue and clinical histories of 30 members of an Indiana family over three generations and found that those who suffered from Alzheimer's all had an alteration in a single gene on chromosome 21.

Jill Murrell, a co-author of the study, said Thursday that the finding provides a genetic basis for a type of Alzheimer's disease that starts at an early age, but a link between the gene and the disease that occurs randomly after the age of 65 has not been established.

FBI: Asians involved with drugs, arms

WASHINGTON — Asian crime syndicates and gangs have become involved in drug trafficking, arms smuggling and gambling in the United States, the director of the FBI told Congress on Thursday.

And, William Sessions told the Senate Governmental Affairs permanent investigations subcommittee "it is likely that Asian criminal organizations will attempt even stronger footholds in America in the near future."

The most serious new threat, he said, comes from Chinese criminals who are "few years ago were small and disorganized but today, backed by violent street gangs, are rapidly expanding operations outside the Asian community" in such areas as narcotics trafficking, gambling, extortion and money-laundering.

Group opposes portrayal of blind man

BALTIMORE — A group opposing the portrayal of a blind man on the ABC sitcom "Good & Evil" is stepping up its campaign to have the character rewritten or the show canceled.

"The writers of this show simply don't understand what life is like for blind people. The lives and futures of the blind are on the line here," said James Gashel, director of governmental affairs for the National Federation of the Blind.

The group began picketing Wednesday in front of ABC's New York City headquarters and affiliates in Chicago, Denver and Los Angeles. Gashel said about 75 people participated in the New York protest.

'Smart bomb' damaging to Noriega

MIAMI — Prosecutors have a witness potentially so damaging to Manuel Noriega that drug agents call him their "smart bomb" in the deposed Panamanian leader's trial, sources close to the case said Thursday.

Convicted trafficker Gabriel Taboada has told investigators he was present in Medellin, Colombia, in 1983 when Noriega sealed his drug protection pact with cartel chief Pablo Escobar by accepting a half dozen French prostitutes and a suitcase bulging with up to \$500,000.

B-2 faults known, scientist says

SEATTLE — The Boeing Co. knew more than two years ago that the "undetectable" B-2 Stealth bomber could be detected with impulse radar, claims a scientist who was fired by the company.

But a company spokesman defended the plane, and said its designers by impulse radar has not been proved.

Radar specialist Terence Barrett said his superiors at Boeing ordered him not to say anything about the potential problem while Boeing and the Air Force lobbied Congress to authorize construction of more B-2s.

FEC: Bush didn't overcharge press

WASHINGTON — The Federal Election Commission handed President Bush a partial victory on Thursday by ruling that reporters were not overcharged for the expenses of Bush campaign aides who helped the press during the 1988 race.

An FEC audit released earlier this week concluded that the Bush campaign had overcharged reporters by about \$360,000 for air fare and travel expenses. Campaign aides and Secret Service agents, and recommended that the campaign be forced to repay the money.

But the six-member commission on Thursday tossed out the portion of the audit that said reporters were overcharged for the expenses of travel aides.

Georgian Fowler backs nominee

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Senate majority for Clarence Thomas' confirmation to the Supreme Court appeared to solidify Thursday as formal debate began on whether to put the black conservative on the nation's highest court.

Sen. Wyche Fowler of Georgia became the 12th Democrat to say he would vote for Thomas. His support appears to assure 52 votes for the nomination as the Senate opened four days of debate.

Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, D-Ohio, Thomas' leading Senate opponent, conceded that Thomas would win confirmation, but vowed to fight on until the Senate votes next Tuesday.

ouye. Hawaii, said Thomas' testimony left a "tangled web of evasion" and "skillful sidestepping" about issues and conservative views he had once espoused.

"The probabilities are that he would be confirmed, but in this business, it's not over until it's over," said Metzenbaum.

Fowler said he would vote against the advice of many supporters, who made "many compelling viewpoints against the nomination."

"My vote is essentially one of hope, a hope that Clarence Thomas will demonstrate the same independence, the same self-reliance and the same promise that are the hallmarks of his career," Fowler said of the nominee, who rose to prominence from poor black family in Georgia.

On the Senate floor, Metzenbaum pleaded with colleagues to study Thomas' testimony before the Senate Judiciary Committee, which declined on a 7-1 vote last week to endorse the nominee.

"No senator should be stampeded into voting for this nomination," Metzenbaum said.

"Go back and look at the record. Go back and see what he said and see what he didn't say. If you do that you may reconsider your previously announced position."

The floor debate focused on whether Thomas had been forthcoming during confirmation hearings.

Opponents like Sen. Daniel In-

Supporters said Thomas properly refused to give answers that might undermine his impartiality to decide cases headed toward the Supreme Court.

Sen. John Danforth, R-Mo., Thomas' champion in the Senate, argued that opponents of the nomination were applying a new standard only a year after David H. Souter won easy confirmation.

"David Souter was called the stealth nominee. It was said he wouldn't answer any questions and yet he was confirmed by a vote of 90-9," Danforth said.

Danforth noted that Thurgood Marshall, the nation's first black justice who retired Tuesday, refused during his 1967 confirmation hearings to comment on the major cases.

"What applied to Thurgood Marshall should apply to Clarence Thomas," Danforth said.

But Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., argued that Thomas was selective in his refusal to discuss issues, remaining silent on abortion while readily discussing such issues as school prayer, the death penalty and the rights of crime victims to testify in criminal cases.

"It is transparently clear that Judge Thomas was not defending his impartiality but defending his prospects for confirmation," Kennedy said.

Although Thomas professes to have an open mind on abortion, he was nominated by President Bush because he is seen as a reliable conservative, Kennedy said.

Rocky Flats plant plan criticized

GOLDEN, Colo. (AP) — Two government committees have criticized plans to resume operations in a laboratory at the Rocky Flats nuclear weapons plant, saying workers could be exposed to plutonium contamination.

The laboratory, known as Building 559, was to have been the model for restarting plutonium operations at the rest of the plant 15 miles northwest of Denver. The lab analyzes radioactive and hazardous waste for disposal, and performs quality control tests on plutonium samples from bomb production lines.

Rocky Flats' plutonium operations were suspended in December 1989 following reported safety violations and other problems. Energy Secretary James Watkins has said he will not allow plutonium operations at the plant to resume until it is safe.

The Advisory Committee on Nuclear Facility Safety, appointed by Watkins, and the Defense Nuclear Facilities Safety Board, which reports to Congress, sent letters expressing their concerns about Building 559 to Watkins on Monday. The Associated Press obtained copies of the letters.

The AP also obtained two reports written by plant operator EG&G Inc. last spring that severely criticized the lab and conclude it is in such bad shape it cannot be fixed to meet safety standards.

"Why restart a facility that will pose such risks to plant workers and will probably have to be shut down shortly after it is started up?" said Jason Salzman, a researcher for Greenpeace US, which obtained the EG&G documents under the Freedom of Information Act.

Haiti wary of military intervention

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Haitian politicians Thursday welcomed international pressure on the army to restore President Jean-Bertrand Aristide to power. But they warned against military intervention.

Aristide told reporters in Washington he believed pressure from the United States and its allies will save his country from "a small gang trying to kill democracy." White House press secretary Marlin Fitzwater said the coup that ousted Haiti's first freely elected president "will not succeed."

There were no signs of military moves to restore Aristide, a leftist priest, to office, and nations supporting his return appeared content with economic and diplomatic sanctions to pressure the Haitian army.

The capital was quiet Thursday, and fewer soldiers were on the street, although an apparently nervous military issued an order banning street demonstrations. More than 100 people are thought to have died in street clashes following Monday's ouster of Haiti's first freely elected president.

Three days after the coup, there appeared to be no government in place and it was unclear how the military intended to establish one.

Brig. Gen. Raoul Cedras, the army's provisional commander-in-chief, said Wednesday that military leaders do not want power, but that Aristide had abused his. Cedras ap-

peared to be pushing for parliament to keep Aristide out of office and hold new elections. Political leaders said nothing had been decided on how to proceed. Several who have spoken out against the coup praised economic and diplomatic pressure on Haiti, but they spoke against military force as an option.

They were concerned by a comment made by President Bush Wednesday that left open the possibility of intervention by "a military force of some sort" under the aegis of the Organization of American States.

At a meeting in Washington, the OAS agreed early Thursday to impose sanctions on Haiti, one of the world's poorest nations, if democracy is not immediately restored. It said it would send a delegation to Haiti to demand Aristide's restoration.

"Before coming, the OAS delegation must make clear whether multinational armed forces is envisioned. If it is, they will have trouble finding people to talk to," said Marc Bazin,

a runner-up in last year's presidential elections.

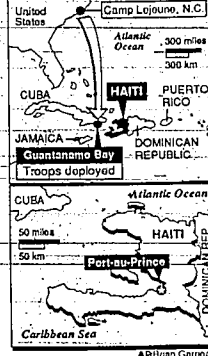
Bazin, a conservative and former World Bank official, was the first Haitian politician to call publicly for Aristide's return.

Sen. Serge Gilles, a socialist who also called for Aristide's return, said talks with the OAS would be out of the question if there was any chance of armed intervention.

"We're not adult-enough-to-go-to-the negotiating table ourselves to find a solution to our problem," he said. More people ventured out in Port-au-Prince on Thursday, but the usually bustling capital of 1 million was far from normal. Some market stalls were selling wares but most shops remained closed and the only painted "tap-tap" buses and taxis stayed off the streets.

Aristide urged his supporters to avoid violence. "We can be always in the street if it's necessary, but always according to law without any kind of violence," he said before leaving Washington.

"With the support of the international community there is no doubt we will be able to save democracy in Haiti," he said. He was to speak later to the U.N. Security Council in New York. Defense Department spokesman Pete Williams said the United States had no interest in using military force to put Aristide back in office. He also said he did not think an evacuation of Americans or other foreigners would be necessary.

Serbia announces parliament takeover

ZAGREB, Yugoslavia — Moving to consolidate its control over what remains of Yugoslavia, the republic of Serbia announced Thursday that it was taking over the federal parliament with three allies.

Although the parliament is virtually defunct, the move appeared to represent Serbia's effort to usurp what remains of federal power. A senior Western diplomat said the move effectively dissolved the eight-member federal presidency, which nominally controls the Yugoslav army.

The army, which launched a major assault against Croatia this week, bombarded areas around historic Dubrovnik, starting a raging forest fire, and closed in on the capital, Zagreb.

Croatian leaders say the attacks on the Adriatic, on the eastern Croatian region of Slavonia and in Banja, south of Zagreb, represent a bid by Serbia to define a "Greater Serbia" that would include most of Yugoslavia. The republic of Slovenia and what remained of Croatia would then be permitted to become independent.

Station says 76 Iraqi officers executed

NICOSIA, Cyprus — An Iraqi opposition radio station was quoted Thursday as saying that 76 Iraqi military officers were executed after a failed attempt to topple Saddam Hussein last month.

Iraq's official Islamic Republic News Agency said the executions were reported by Iraqi radio, a clandestine radio station that broadcasts from somewhere in the Persian Gulf region. The IRNA report was not clear on whether the reported executions were connected to Saddam's surprise firing of Prime Minister Saadoun Hammadi in mid-September. No reasons were announced for Hammadi's removal.

Israel signs pact limiting missile info

JERUSALEM — Israel will sign an international pact limiting the spread of missile technology, the Defense Department said Thursday. The daily Haaretz newspaper reported Israel accepted the treaty rules following U.S. pressure and a threat to close Pentagon suppliers to Israel's defense industry.

The treaty, which was signed by senior Israeli officials, says Secretary of State James A. Baker III was particularly tough with Israel and officials had the impression "the (Bush) administration was after us." The officials were not named in the report.

4 tourists die in mountain storm

ZERMATT, Switzerland — Four German tourists died of exposure and exhaustion after being surprised by a sudden storm in the Alps, police said Thursday.

Police said the tragedy happened Wednesday as the climbing party approached the peak of the 13,741-foot Breithorn mountain near Switzerland's southern border with Italy. The four were up to 62 mph, poor visibility and plummeting temperatures forced the party to retreat but they died before reaching safety, a police statement said.

Canadian workers continue walkout

OTTAWA — Parliament passed a bill ordering striking Canadian public servants to end a national walkout, but several hundred workers continued to picket and block traffic Thursday in some parts of the country.

The bill was passed late Wednesday after Supreme Court Justice Frank Iacobucci, acting as the Queen's representative, gave royal assent to the legislation during a Parliament session.

Moments later, Daryl Bean, president of the Public Service Alliance of Canada, declared the union had lost the battle to block the legislation. But he said it would continue to fight a government wage freeze.

The strikers were protesting a government freeze on wages this year and an offer of only a 3 percent increase next year.

Soviet sub mishap a 'technical' snafu

MOSCOW — An explosion on a Soviet submarine hurled fragments of a missile launch tube into the White Sea off Russia's northern coast, but caused no fuel leakage, the Defense Ministry said Thursday.

The Tass news agency quoted a ministry spokesman as saying the blast occurred Friday during a training exercise aboard a Northern Fleet submarine.

Tass said the explosion was caused by a "technical malfunction," but gave no further details of the blast. It said there were no injuries.

Afghanistan considers coalition rule

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — A Soviet peace plan for Afghanistan, proposes replacing the country's leadership with a power-sharing coalition led by guerrillas and the non-Communist prime minister, rebel sources said Thursday.

But Soviet Foreign Minister Boris Pankin denied he made any proposals during talks at the United Nations for replacing the nation's leadership.

Pankin said he reiterated the U.S. and Soviet pledge to stop arms deliveries to Afghanistan and mentioned "a period of transition" before free elections in the war-torn mountainous country.

Eastern Orthodox leader dies at 77

ISTANBUL, Turkey — Patriarch Dimitrios I, the spiritual leader of Eastern Orthodox Christians who pushed his church to expand ties with people of other faiths, died Wednesday at age 77.

The spiritual leader of the world's 300 million Eastern Orthodox Christians, a firm advocate of Christian unity, died at the American Admiral Bristol Hospital. He had suffered a severe heart attack on Monday.

The body of the primate lay in state Thursday at St. George Church for the faithful to view and pay their last respects. He is to be buried at the monastery of Balgiti in a special cemetery for patriarchs, according to Stavros Stathouloupoulos, Greek embassy spokesman in Ankara.

The patriarch's successor will be chosen by the Holy Synod, made up of 18 leading churchmen, but it was not immediately known when the process to choose a new leader would begin.

U.N. search team begins using helos

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Weapons inspectors searching for Scud missiles and launchers flew U.N. helicopters over Iraqi territory Thursday for the first time since Iraq backed down and gave its permission to inspect.

The U.N. inspectors wanted their own helicopters to make unrestricted surveillance flights in remote areas and to stage surprise visits at sites suspected of holding Iraqi weapons. Leaders do not want power, but that Aristide had abused his. Cedras ap-

The 20-member team took off from Baghdad's Rashid military base, said Alastair Livingston, an official at the U.N. Special Commission's office in Bahrain.

The inspection teams work for the commission, which is overseeing the elimination of Iraq's long-range missiles and nuclear, chemical and biological weapons programs under terms of the Persian Gulf War ceasefire.

Saddam Hussein's government long opposed the U.N. helicopters, aboard Iraqi aircraft. But, Baghdad government gave in to demands by the U.N. Security Council last week after warnings from the United States that the lack of cooperation could bring renewed military action.

At last week, the Iraqis detained a team of U.N. nuclear experts for more than four days in an attempt to prevent removal of the documents that U.N. officials say detail Iraq's clandestine program to produce nuclear arms. Iraq finally allowed the nuclear team to carry out 25,000

pages of documents. U.N. officials agreed to allow an Iraqi liaison officer to accompany each flight by the three U.S.-made CH-53 Sea King helicopters, provided by Germany. The aircraft flew in from Turkey on Wednesday.

Livingston, the commission's field operations chief in Manama, said the helos team will spend the next several days flying over western Iraq to search for fixed-site launchers used to fire Scud missiles into Israel during the Gulf War.

Their mission is "to identify and destroy, or provide supervision for the destruction of, some fixed launch sites for Scud missiles," he said. Livingston played down concerns over the inspectors' safety.

"The teams are doing business as normal," Livingston said. Only two of the many U.N. inspection teams have met any overt hostility or interferences from Iraqi officials. Those were the nuclear experts last week and a previous nuclear team last summer.

The helicopters "will facilitate the teams' capabilities," allowing them to scan all of Iraq's territory, Livingston said. The aircraft will stay in set air corridors over Baghdad, and nearby sensitive military areas, but once over the open desert they will move freely, he said.

The missile team is led by Douglas England, an American who said earlier he would supervise destruction of 28 Scud launchers in the western desert.

Pentagon: No formal word on bases

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon hasn't received a formal notification from the Philippine government about a deadline for leaving Subic Bay naval base, a spokesman said Thursday.

"We're waiting to hear from the Philippine government about what their final disposition is," Pete Williams told reporters at a Defense Department briefing.

New national holiday marks German unity

HAMBURG, Germany (AP) — Germans celebrated the 10th anniversary of reunification Thursday against a backdrop of economic travail in the east and an upsurge of violence against outsiders.

Leaders reported progress in overcoming the problems of transforming eastern Germany into a democratic and capitalist society, but said there is much to be done and urged Germans to show greater understanding for each other.

At the same time, government leaders used their forums during the "citizens' festival" of German Unity Day — a national holiday — to decry the alarming rise of violence aimed at refugees and other foreigners in recent weeks.

"We owe respect and tolerance to our foreign fellow residents," Chancellor Helmut Kohl said in a televised speech. "Germany is a land friendly to foreigners," and will remain so," he declared.

In the latest incident, two East German citizens seriously burned Thursday when a firebomb was thrown into a home for refugees outside Duiseldorf.

Several thousand people demonstrated in central Hamburg against the wave of violence carried by banners with such slogans as "Never Again Pogroms" and "International Life, Not Stupid German-ness." Arrested said eight people were accused for fighting, and 40 cars were damaged by unknown vandals.

Kohl and a long list of national and state leaders were in Hamburg, Germany's second largest city and leading port, for the day's main festivities.

The city-state won the honor of being host for the first birthday celebration because it currently holds the presidency of the second chamber of the national parliament. The main celebration will be held each year in the state holding that office.

American Falls approves seminary project

AMERICAN FALLS (AP) — The City Council has overridden the American Falls Planning and Zoning Commission and approved construction of a Mormon religious education center across from the city's high school.

"I think the controversy here is hysteria and probably prejudice and the building is not the real issue here," said Councilman John Mellhoff. "I cannot find anything in the code that does not permit this building, and it would like to cast my vote to override."

The permit requires the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints to provide eight to 10 parking spaces when it builds the seminary, and it calls for a review of the parking situation later to determine if more spaces should be added.

The current building plans include only four parking spaces. Three of the other councilmen joined Mellhoff Wednesday night in reversing the planners' denial of the permit needed to construct the seminary building. Councilman Gerald Mauch was the lone dissenter.

Opponents said they might contest the council action in court. Mauch voiced the same concerns that residents of the neighborhood expressed when they successfully convinced the planning commission to deny the permit.

"I don't see how they can provide for additional parking in the future," he said. The seminary would provide easy access to daily religious classes for Mormon students at

American Falls High School, who now must go to their individual churches in the community for that training. Church officials have said American Falls is one of the few high schools without easy access to seminary classes.

"This is all we wanted," said Craig Jorgensen, the lawyer for the Mormon Church. "The scales were so far tipped to our side that I think this was the only decision the council could make."

But Councilman Bruce Hauber, who supported the project, expressed disappointment over the controversy the plan generated. "This town is making me awful mad," Hauber said. "This issue has polarized the people and that is wrong. We need to get together because as long as we take this type of action and approach, this will continue to happen."

Organization says it meant to criticize Craig

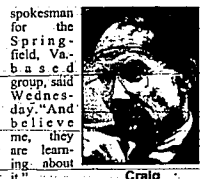
LEWISTON (AP) — A National Right to Work Committee spokesman says the group's recent letter to 13,000 Idaho voters meant every word of its criticism of Sen. Larry Craig, R-Idaho.

The organization's attack came despite its \$1,000 campaign contribution to the freshman senator last year.

The letter accuses Craig of breaking faith on the issue of the Hatch Act, a law that restricts public employees from some political acts.

Craig says the law is vague and he supports a measure to reform it. But the Right to Work Committee says proposed changes would amount to repealing the restrictions, giving employee unions greater political clout.

"As appreciative as we may be on past votes, he's dead wrong on this one and his pro-Right to Work constituents need to know about that," Steve Kerekes, a

Craig's chief of staff, Greg Casey, said the senator was standing firm on the issue.

But it doesn't signal a rift between Craig and the organization, he said.

"Don't misunderstand us. We're no big friend of federal unions," Casey said. "You can call it (the letter) a little unfair and certainly we would look at it as a little unfair. But we're not going to trash them on this. It's too bad they feel they have to trash us."

Idaho may lose marsh areas under changes

BOISE (AP) — Idaho has lost more than half of its wetlands over time, and more marshy areas in the state could dry up under proposed federal title changes.

The Idaho Fish and Game Commission on Thursday heard from biologists that between 50 and 70 percent of the state's remaining wetlands could be removed from a list of wetlands, possibly opening them up for farming or development.

"Wetlands are critical to fish and wildlife," said Tom Hemker, wildlife game manager of upland game birds. "They also filter out other contaminants—among other things."

Four federal agencies including the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service with the responsibility of wetlands management published a 1989 manual on identifying those areas for protection.

The proposed changes to the manual include the requirement that the lands be inundated by water for 15 or more consecutive days or be saturated

rated to the ground surface for 21 or more straight days, during the "growing season" when plants can grow.

The soil in the areas must be indicative of a wetland and the plants should qualify as those found in marshes.

Before, two of those criteria were needed. That would climb to all three.

"With the seasonal wetlands in Idaho, that is a problem," said Peggy Guillory, a Fish and Wildlife biologist. "It does seem we're going to have an issue here in the arid West."

Fish and Game staff told the commission that many of the seasonal wetlands which provide valuable habitat for waterfowl, upland game birds like pheasant and other wildlife could lose their protection against dredging or adding fill to use the land for other purposes.

Seventy percent of the wetlands historically found up and down the Snake River were flooded by hydroelectric and diversion dams.

Fish and Game reviews applications to dredge or fill in areas. Under the congressional proposal, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers would take over the authority over whether the land can be developed.

August field testing using the proposed manual in marshes in Idaho showed that only two of 16 would be identified as wetlands. Two samples of those losing the status would be the Roswell Slough near Parma, and Fish and Game's showcase area, the Centennial Marsh near Fairfield.

They are flooded for only part of the year, although about 20 percent

at Roswell would qualify. Idaho has about 385,000 acres of wetlands left, or 0.7 percent of the state's land base. Some 56 percent has been lost over time.

Guillory said determining if the wetlands are flooded or saturated for the exact time periods is difficult. Commissioner Keith Carlson of Lewiston recommended that a "strongly worded" statement of the Fish and Game board's support for wetlands be sent to the state's congressional delegation.

Corrections begins to remove inmates

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Department of Corrections says it will take 20 state inmates out of county jails this week, helping to ease a backlog of 158 state prisoners in local jails statewide.

Corrections director Richard Vernon said Wednesday that 12 of Ada County's 13 backlogged state prisoners would be removed by week's end.

"From that point on, we'll be picking up people within seven days after being called in by the county jail," Vernon said.

"On Tuesday, 4th District Judge Duff McKee gave Vernon 14 days to clear state felons out of county jails. For years, Corrections has relied on county jails to absorb a backlog of convicted felons until space is available in state prisons.

Stallings admits bouncing checks

WASHINGTON — Congressman Richard Stallings conceded Thursday he bounced seven checks last year at the House Bank, saying he "misspoke" last week when he told reporters he had overdrawn his account only once.

Following a General Accounting Office report that the House Bank routinely covered congressional overdrafts for 24-hour periods at the taxpayers' expense, the Idaho Democrat told reporters last week his only not-sufficient-funds check last year was the result of a bank error.

But Thursday, Stallings said he discovered this week that his checks bounced six times between October 1989 to August 1990, and that one written in May 1990 had

been returned because it did not contain a signature. "If you look at the bank statements, you're not able to tell which checks were rejected or held over a day, and that's why I've been going through here naively," Stallings said. "I balanced my check book and it always came out exactly right."

Committee would review two recent audits that had disclosed the representative's bad checks.

Stallings said Thursday he had written the checks assuming that his monthly paycheck was deposited into his account on the last day of every month, when it was actually deposited the first day of the month.

"I assumed the money was there the last day of the month and it wasn't," he said. "That's why they never contacted me, because they said they knew the money would be there the next day."

Stallings said he examined his personal banking records on Wednesday after Rep. David Obey, D-Wis., told him he had only learned of his own overdraft funds after asking the bank's sergeant-at-arms for a letter verifying his banking record.

Fall colors are at their best this week in Sawtooths

TWIN FALLS — Fall colors will be at their prime throughout the Sawtooth National Forest this week, the Forest Service says.

All districts in the sprawling forest are reporting vibrant displays of reds, oranges and yellows, with the brightest colors evident at higher elevations, according to Barbara Todd, public affairs assistant for the SNF office in Twin Falls.

A good assortment of campsites will remain open for hunters and other visitors until closed by winter weather, Todd said. Campground fees have been waived at many sites where water and trash-removal services are no longer provided. Visitors need to pack in their own water, toilet paper and garbage sacks.

Forest visitors are reminded to wear bright hunter-orange or red if they travel away from developed sites because Saturday is the first day of deer-hunting season.

Dogs suspected of killing sheep at farm near Kimberly

KIMBERLY — Dogs are suspected of killing 12 sheep at a farm near Kimberly Tuesday night. Twin Falls County Sheriff's Deputy Keith Schmidt went to the Kimberly-area home of Dave Walker Wednesday morning and found 12 dead sheep with wounds to the neck, ears and other parts.

Schmidt reported finding large dog footprints around the carcasses but was unable to determine how many dogs had been there. Walker estimated the sheep were worth \$1,200, according to Schmidt's report. The incident is still under investigation.

Residents fear 8-plexes will bring them trouble

TWIN FALLS — The "not-in-my-neighborhood" theme surfaced in another Twin Falls public forum Thursday night — not in opposition to a juvenile justice facility or a prison work center, but against a proposed apartment complex.

Increased traffic, decreased property values and the social status of renters who might move into a north Twin Falls neighborhood were grievances that residents of the area voiced against the Sawtooth project, proposed by Pacific Housing Association, Inc.

"You're going to tear our property down to hell and we're going to do our damndest to stop it," said property owner Nite Casten, who lives at 1201 Evergreen Drive.

The Oregon-based company wants to build 160 apartment units in 20 buildings between the 1200 and 1300 blocks of Locust.

The project, which requires that renters have annual incomes of \$16,400 or less for a family of four, is being denounced by neighbors who say their property values hover in the \$100,000 to \$200,000 range.

One resident said that some of his

neighbors spend \$10,000 on their landscaping alone.

Grumblings about traffic on Locust and nearby narrow residential streets and the suggestion that immigrants and thieves might invade the neighborhood were applauded by the crowd of about 60 angry residents.

Mildred Moore complained that the people who live in the new complex would not be assimilated well into the neighborhood.

"You want to put that kind of a project in a neighborhood like this?"

Three members of the Pacific Housing board relitigated the residents' arguments by saying the apartments would be filled by people who already live in Twin Falls. These renters may be young couples, senior citizens or families working to get by.

"The people are already here," Board Member Cindy Wooten said. "According to Idaho Housing there are people living doubled up and in places that are not decent at all. We are trying to provide safe and affordable housing."

"At our expense," a voice in the audience cried out.

The company arranged the question-and-answer session.

Magic Valley lawmakers tout reapportionment plan

BOISE — The three Magic Valley representatives on the Legislature's special reapportionment committee Thursday crafted a plan for south-central Idaho that all of them say they can support.

Getting the rest of the 20-member committee to agree to it, though, may prove difficult.

The committee adjourned until today with some regions — notably Ada and Canyon counties and the Magic Valley — more or less agreed on their own regional redistricting plans.

The delegations from eastern Idaho and northern Idaho, however, remain deeply divided on how to redraw the district lines in their regions, and an assistant attorney general told the committee it's running out of time to come up with a solution.

"... It is the opinion of this office that the present Legislature could not stand for election in 1992," Deputy Attorney General Frank Walker said. "Further, if the Legislature fails to reapportion itself during this upcoming session, the Legislature would, in all likelihood, be appointed by court order."

House Speaker Tom Boyd asked for an opinion whether a 1986 constitutional amendment forces redistricting before the

next election. He also asked the latest date the state can hold a primary election, if it gets embroiled in a deadlock over reapportionment and is forced to postpone the primary.

Legislative leaders have said reapportionment, added to all the other issues before the regular session of the Legislature, could produce a snarl that would prevent the state from holding its primary election as scheduled May 26. The filing deadline is April 3, which is about the time recent legislative sessions have adjourned.

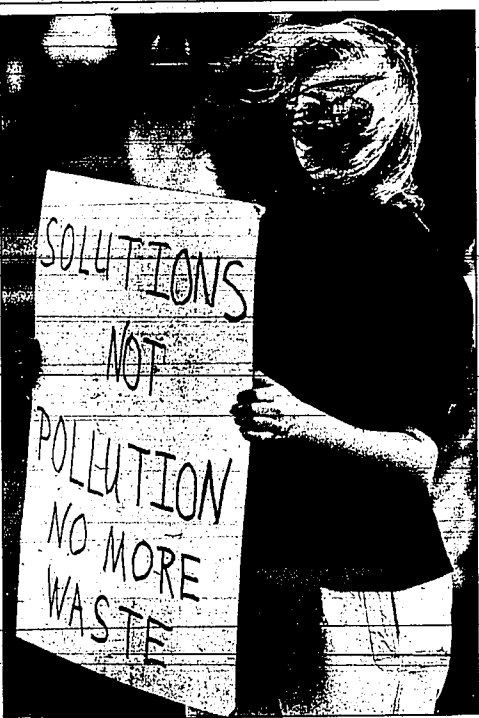
Walker's opinion said if the primary election must be delayed, the latest the state could hold it is July 21. Under that timetable, the filing deadline could be no later than May 29.

Walker said the primary election can't be held later than July 21 and still meet requirements for certification of results, printing of ballots and the general election and getting them out to county clerks for absentee voting.

The new Magic Valley proposal would create five districts entirely within the traditional eight-county region, except for two precincts brought in from Custer County.

The first district would be composed of

Activists skeptical of INEL cleanup plan

TWIN FALLS — The Idaho National Engineering Laboratory is not destined to be the nation's nuclear waste dump, INEL officials say, but local activists aren't so sure.

At a public hearing in Twin Falls Thursday night, officials from the Idaho Nuclear Waste Cleanup Authority outlined plans to clean up several contaminated sites.

About two dozen people showed up to ask questions and comment about the federal Department of Energy's "site-

specific plan" for cleanup projects at INEL in the next year.

Half of those gathered outside the Canyon Springs Inn before the meeting, carrying signs and demonstrating their opposition to Energy Department plans to bring spent nuclear fuel from the Fort St. Vrain reactor in Colorado to INEL.

Anti-nuclear activist Bill Chisholm of Buhl asked how the facility can expect to clean up its waste when plans to bring more projects and more radioactive material to INEL are already being laid.

"We have more proposals for cleaning up sites than we have money to do it," he said.

Counterfeit \$100 bills being passed in Ketchum stores

KETCHUM — Counterfeit \$100 bills were spent at several Ketchum stores on Thursday, prompting a city-wide search for a stocky man traveling with a young boy.

The first of at least nine phony bills was spent at the Ketchum Korner clothing store early Thursday morning, Ketchum police said. It was determined to be counterfeit when a store employee tried to deposit the bill at a Ketchum bank.

"It feels a little bit different than normal," Ketchum Police Chief Cal Nevland said of the fake currency. Nine bills had been discovered as of 5 p.m. Thursday from nine different Ketchum stores. Each bill had the same serial number: L14783514C.

Ketchum police released a description of the suspect as a stocky white male in his late 30s, approximately 5 feet, 10 inches to 6 feet tall, with dark hair and couple of days' growth of beard.

He was seen with a young boy, approximately three years

old, who was wearing a T-shirt and a blue sweatshirt with a gold stripe.

The Secret Service has been notified, according to Nevland. The counterfeit bills are suspected to be from San Francisco, he said. They are similar to currency with the same serial number that has appeared in Montana.

Ketchum police were contacting local motels and bars in their search for the suspect Thursday night. Anyone with information about the case should call the Ketchum Police Department at 726-9333.

Air quality study finds no health hazard from field burning

TWIN FALLS — Air-quality monitoring by a private consultant found no air quality levels that were hazardous to health during this fall's grass-burning season in the Magic Valley.

The worst 24-hour periods during a six-week period weren't bad enough to warrant health-hazard warnings, such as those sometimes encountered in Boise during the winter, Harry Guenther of the University of Idaho Agricultural Extension Service said Thursday.

Dames & Moore, the Portland, Ore., consulting firm that conducted the study

collected air samples through August and part of September.

"That doesn't mean there weren't some days when there could have been some hours where the level exceeded the limits," Guenther said.

Dames & Moore will next compile the data gathered in nearly two years of study with meteorological data. Its work, presented to a local advisory committee, is part of a study funded by the Legislature after Jacklin Seed Co. of Post Falls started

contracting with farmers to grow seed in the Magic Valley.

Grass-seed fields are burned off after harvest to stimulate the grass into producing seed the next year. That, in turn, has led to clashes between farmers and neighbors in other areas as the smoke walks into the air.

The Legislature funded the current study to establish what pollution exists in southern Idaho before Jacklin begins an expansion that may reach 13,000 acres of seed.

The information can then be used to determine how much of an impact grass-seed burning has on southern Idaho air quality.

Lake claim appears headed for court

COEUR D'ALENE — It appears the Coeur d'Alene Tribe's ownership claim to Lake Coeur d'Alene is bound for court. State Auditor J.D. Williams said Wednesday several hundred hours of intense research has failed to produce any unexpected information surrounding the claim. "We (state officials) are in the final stages of preparing a report to the Land Board," Williams said in a telephone interview. "And we have found no major surprises." The Land Board on Tuesday was expected to decide whether to enter into negotiations with the tribe over its claim to all but the northern tip of Lake Coeur d'Alene. But the lake report wasn't on a preliminary agenda for the session released this week. If the Land Board does not act, it will be up to the tribe to take the issue to court.

BSU program aims at Tibetan refugees

BOISE — A program at Boise State University this Saturday kicks off a campaign to resettle 25 Tibetan refugees in Boise next year. Only 500 Tibetan nationals now live in the United States, and Congress has made it legal for 1,000 more to resettle here after fleeing from Chinese oppression. The Tibetan-U.S. Resettlement project is providing the means. Edward Bedner, executive director of the project, said Wednesday that many Americans don't know what is happening in Tibet. Tashi Dundop, a Tibetan national who works for West One Bank in Boise, said he was confident the project will work in Boise.

Traffic accident draws prison sentence

LEWISTON — A 20-year-old Grangeville man has been sentenced to two to five years in prison for his role in a traffic accident that killed one Grangeville teenager and left another disabled. Second District Judge Ronald Schilling told Alvin R. "Allen" Butler Jr. on Wednesday that he considered his history of traffic and alcohol-related offenses — including some since the fatal accident in March — in ordering prison time for his vehicular manslaughter conviction. Butler was driving the pickup truck from which 16-year-old Jodie R. Prall was thrown in the accident on a county road early on the morning of March 22. Prall died at the scene.

Source of Boise water problem found

BOISE — For the first time since the cancer-causing solvent perchloroethylene was discovered in Boise ground water two years ago, the state has documented a source of the contamination. Van Waters & Rogers Inc., which operated a warehouse at the current site of Pier 1 Imports near the Boise Towne Square mall, has confirmed it is at least partially responsible for fouling the ground water with perch. Seattle-based Van Waters has until Oct. 11 to develop a plan for cleaning up its share of the contamination.

Beer, TV show will help orphan moose

SPOKANE — The producers of television's popular "Northern Exposure" and the makers of a trendy beer have agreed to help the Spokane zoo raise money to build a home for two orphan moose. The plan is for an event at which patrons would pay to have a Moosehead Beer or two with actors from "Northern Exposure," said Judith Gilmore, director of community development for Walk in the Wild zoo. The proceeds would be used to help build a \$36,000 exhibit for two moose the state Department of Wildlife gave the zoo in June. The orphan calves, a brother and sister, were about four days old when found in Peid Oreille County.

Kids help teacher try bungee jump

YAKIMA, Wash. (AP) — Teacher Alex Cruz looked down at his 4th grade class from a height of 17 stories. Some were screaming. Others were praying. Some were cutting deals. "Could I have your car if you die?" one yelled. "Could I have your stereo?" another said. "He's nuts," said 10-year-old Chris Richards.

"Let's all say a prayer for Mr. Cruz," one anxious child instructed. Cruz stood obliviously to their taunts. Then, with arms outstretched, he jumped.

He plunged head first towards the ground, until, at the last second, his 50 mph fall was stopped by the bungee cord wrapped around his ankles.

He was lowered to the ground amid the cheers of the kids. "I loved it!" said an excited Cruz, 30, as he slugged high fives with the students who had pooled their money to buy his fall Wednesday.

Move over "Zipper," "Kamikaze," and tame old Ferris wheel. Bungee jumping is the latest midway attraction at the fair. A company is charging \$49.90 for Central-Washington State Fair patrons who want to jump from a cage suspended 170 feet above the ground by a crane.

Organizers said 160 people had taken the plunge since the fair opened last Friday.

"This is one of the safest rides here," said Steve Bisyak, who is helping Rapid Descents "Bungee Jumping of Gold Bar, Wash., operate its attraction.

Giant 9th Circuit Appeals contends breaking up would be hard to do

BILLINGS, Mont. (AP) — The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, rebuffing attempts to split it in half, says a large size fosters efficiency and should serve as a model for merging other, smaller circuits. A position paper, citing arguments by Chief Judge J. Clifford Wallace, argues against a proposal to break up the sprawling circuit.

Instead, other circuits should be merged and modeled after the 9th Circuit's efficiencies, the paper reported in the Billings, Mont., Gazette said.

The 9th Circuit covers the largest territory and population of any circuit court in the country, hearing appeals from nine states and the Pacific trust territories.

"It has 28 judges, about a dozen more than any other circuit, and serves about a fifth of the nation's population."

Sen. Slade Gordon, R-Wash., has proposed legislation to split the 9th Circuit. His bill would leave Arizona, California, Nevada, Guam, Hawaii and the Northern Marianas Islands in the 9th Circuit. A newly created 12th Circuit would cover Montana, Alaska, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. The appeals court position paper argues that this is the seventh attempt since 1940 to halve the appeals court.

In the paper, Wallace contends the circuit court handles its burden well and serves as an example to other courts facing large caseloads.

"If we are successful — the judges, the lawyers, the supporting staff — in demonstrating that a large circuit such as ours can function well, there is a viable alternative to the balkanization of the federal appellate structure," he said.

"If we are not willing to end up with a large number of circuits, what is the alternative? The alternative suggests itself in having larger circuits which take care of their own intracircuit law."

Instead of creating more circuits, Wallace suggests combining existing ones into five larger courts. The 9th Circuit could provide the example, he said.

Sen. Conrad Burns, R-Mont., a co-sponsor of Gordon's bill, said he disagrees. He said the caseload is too much for one circuit to handle, and has resulted in inconsistencies and long delays.

"We have too many cases coming out of the 9th Circuit which show that the right hand does not know what the left is doing," he said when the bill was introduced in August.

Burns also argues that the long delays mean excessive lawyers' bills for people and businesses involved in cases pending before the 9th Circuit.

Amoco Oil will close Wyoming refinery

CASPER, Wyo. (AP) — Amoco Oil Co. officials announced Thursday they will close the Casper refinery by early December, costing 210 workers their jobs unless they move to other company locations.

The closure stems from the company's desire not to spend \$150 million to meet environmental regulations at the 78-year-old refinery.

According to the Casper and Washington state officials, the refinery is a prime candidate for environmental projects aimed at our small size, limited crude oil flexibility, and marginal performance tipped the scales," refinery manager Larry McVay said at a news conference.

Just last month Casper officials announced they were firing Amoco \$50,000 because the refinery was discharging wastewater to the city treatment plant that violated the city's contract with the city.

The fire was part of a negotiated settlement that also called for Amoco to take immediate steps to comply with contract requirements for treating industrial wastes. That settlement did not resolve a dispute between the city and Amoco over the refinery's ammonia discharges.

The company in June asked the city to amend its ammonia discharge limit from the current 35 milligrams per liter to the federally mandated maximum of 100 milligrams per liter to make it easier for Amoco to comply.

In early September city officials said they intended to increase the limit to the federal level. The plant is one of Amoco's smaller refineries and averages daily crude runs of about 28,000 barrels, according to company officials.

TWIN FALLS — Senior citizens don't sit around in rocking chairs much any more. In fact, they hardly ever sit. And the Magic Valley offers them plenty of reasons to get out of the house.

Fern Manning, 78, stays busy doing volunteer work in the community. When asked what she does in her spare time, she answered quickly, "I don't have any spare time," she said.

Helping others

Manning serves on the Idaho Centennial Committee. She volunteers at the Buzz Langdon Information Center and helps process mailings at the College of Southern Idaho. "A retired teacher, she belongs to several business organizations and is active in church work."

"When I was teaching school, I always wanted to sleep just five more minutes in the morning," Manning said. "Now I'm up at 6 a.m., my calendar is booked solid and I have more energy than I ever have before."

"The senior citizens in the Magic Valley are a very active group of people," said Rosemary Evans, director of CSI's Retired Senior Volunteer Program. Evans coordinates 1,100 seniors, placing them at nonprofit organizations like March of Dimes, United Way, Festival of Trees and Paint Magic.

"The Senior Companions and Foster Grandparents programs, sponsored by the federally funded Office on Aging, also attract large numbers. And, for seniors who prefer the paying job market, the office offers two older worker programs: The Job Training Partnership Act and the Senior Community Service Employment Program."

Having fun

Manning gives the Magic Valley additional high scores for entertainment activities.

"I love the concerts and music events here," said Manning, who also takes advantage of senior citizen travel and restaurant discounts. Sometimes, Manning and four of her friends take turns cooking before they enjoy an evening out.

Those who prefer being part of a larger group often hang out at senior citizen centers. Mike Youngman, director of the Twin Falls center, said the center serviced more than 800 seniors last year.

Seniors eat hot lunches at the center five days a week for a \$1.75 donation per meal. Crafts are made and sold, with classes sponsored by The Homestead. Some seniors play pinocle, bingo or rummy at the center. Listen to guest speakers expound on the pros and cons of vacation spots in Idaho or the importance of proper home insulation. A number of them sign up for trips to museums or to Jackpot.

Dances, held semi-monthly at the center, are well attended. Movies, generally, are not. "We set up a large screen TV and rented videos for a while, but there was no interest in that," Youngman said.

According to Lynn Hughes, contract manager for the Arta Agency on Aging, national trends point to a drop in attendance at many senior centers, which could result in some centers being phased out. The general idea is that a 60-year-old in today's world is much younger and healthier than 60-year-olds once were. Today's seniors, many of them still working, do not always feel as if they belong in a senior center.

The Jerome Senior Center, feeling the pinch, has looked for ways to local residents to eat at the center for a nominal fee. Maxine Christopherson, site director for the Senior Citizen Center in Eden, says

Senior Serenaders' big band sound strikes a chord with older crowd

Many senior citizens like to dance, but hard rock is not their style. Enter Howard Wiseman and his Senior Serenaders.

Trumpeter Wiseman's dance band specializes in big band music from the 1930s and '40s. The band is senior citizens playing music for senior citizens — all band members are over 65. John Gillespie is the violinist and Craig Graybill plays saxophone. Tony Cortez is on drums, and Ruth Medford plays piano. Claude Wiseman, Howard's brother, plays clarinet.

Wiseman, 81, formed the band nine years ago both to have fun and to provide an enjoyable activity for other seniors. "I think we are the only dance band playing this kind of music in this area," said Wiseman, a retired salesman and native of the Magic Valley.

The members practice once a week and can offer a repertoire of 250 pieces of music. They play everything from waltzes and fox trots to rumbas, folkies and pattern dances like the French minuet. Most of their music is a return to yesteryear, far from the music of today's teen-agers, which Wiseman characterizes as "a bunch of guitar chords and drumbeats."

"People organize groups to save the whales and the spotted owls, but nobody has organized a group to save the old-time music," Wiseman said. "We are trying."

Decked out in matching blue vests, the

"One of the things I try to do at a senior citizen dance is to get the men to spread themselves around because there are always more women," Wiseman said. "Once I told the ladies to pretend they

were teen-agers and get in the corner and wiggle around and pretend they were dancing with the men — but they didn't go for it."

Wiseman admits that he likes to sneak off the bandstand occasionally, to try his hand (or foot) at a spin around the dance floor. "If I get going very fast, I can make it around the hall about once," he said, with a chuckle, "but it sure is fun."

Artist's exacting work on silkscreen batiks pays off

KETCHUM — Birds have been kind to Jennifer Bellingor.

Through her powers of observation, they have unwittingly given her the inspiration to painstakingly recreate their forms on silkscreen batiks.

The results have been beautiful and well received by the public, so much so that she was recently chosen to exhibit her work in one of the most prestigious wildlife exhibits in the world.

Bellingor was one of only 118 international artists out of a field of 1,200 entries to participate in the "1991 Birds in Art" juried exhibition at the Leigh Yawkey-Woodson Art Museum in Wausau, Wis.

Bellingor's batik painting, "Meticulous Meadow," will be on display through Oct. 27. From there the display will travel to exhibits at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City, The Ward Museum of Wildfowl Art in Salisbury, Md., and the Washington State Historical Society.

Bellingor's rise to national prominence has not been an overnight success story.

Now 41, Bellingor has been working over the last 22 years to refine and improve her one-of-a-kind batik wildlife paintings.

"You rarely see batik," Bellingor says. "We're still a pretty rare breed."

The batik process is difficult and time consuming, and without an exacting hand, the results can look amateurish.

"It's not like oil where you can scrape it off and start over," she explains. "I equate it more with watercolor, but watercolor is a lot faster and with batik, you might

spend days on something before you realize you'd better just scrap it."

To create a batik painting, stencils are used to confine areas of colored ink and a squeegee is then pulled across the stencil, or screen, to deposit the ink onto the paper. This becomes a lengthy process as

Bellingor typically uses 14 or more colors and each color requires a separate stencil.

Bellingor has experimented with a new technique she derived when she tried to add some metallic color to fish she was painting two years ago.

She came up with a new painting method where she overprints her batiks with acrylic fabric paint. Similar to glazing an oil painting, this process adds more texture, rich color and a three-dimensional look to her work.

"With the new painting method I don't feel like I have any of the old restrictions I had with traditional batik. I pretty much can get any result I want."

Since she had her first show three years ago, Bellingor has cut back her studio time to three days a week and now produces less than 30 paintings a year.

Represented by the Stinson Gallery in Ketchum, Seattle, Wash., and Anchorage, Alaska, Bellingor has her work cut out for her to keep these three galleries stocked.

In addition, she does commission pieces upon request and has done posters for various organizations.

The Wood River chapter of Ducks Unlimited chose her work for its annual fund-raising poster in 1984 and has again chosen her work for the 1991 auction/dinner poster to be held Oct. 25.

She has also recently done work for The Audubon Society in Anchorage, the

First experiences can be exciting but unsettling for all of us, and that's why the psychology section of book stores is always full of coping books for adults. But children are the ones

For decades, Fred Rogers helped make kids feel OK about themselves, and some of his advice and comfort comes bound and ready to

administer in "Mister Rogers' First Experience Books" (Penguin & Grosset Group; \$5.99 paperback; \$13.95 hardcover).

Each of the 10 books uses easy-to-read text and color photographs to deal with a different topic, such as

gaining a new sibling or friend (The New Baby, Making Friends), going somewhere new (Moving, Going to Day-Care),

"Going to the Doctor" or trying something new ("Going to the Post-Office," "Going on an Airplane").

Country awards push conservative boundaries

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - A single mother won the top female singer's award. The honored video was about domestic violence. The vocal group was a long-haired band with the message: "Don't conform."

No it wasn't the MTV awards. It was country music's night to honor its own.

President and first lady Barbara Bush were in the audience at the Grand-Ole Opry House on Wednesday when 25th annual Country Music Association awards were presented.

They and a national television audience got a glimpse of how country music is evolving from the tradition-steeped, conservative music of the heartland.

The musician of the year, for example, was West Coast picker Mark O'Connor, whose roots run to skateboards rather than farm tractors. He broke a 10-year monopoly on the honor that has been held by Chet Atkins and veteran fiddlers Johnny Gimble.

"The whole thrust at the Country Music Association is to let people know country music is changing," said Mandy Wilson, spokeswoman for the 7,000-member organization. "Country music can be hip. More young people are beginning to realize this."

"Perhaps no one reflects that better than Garth Brooks, who won entertainer-of-the-year and three other awards. Last month, his "Ropin' the Wind" was the first album ever to debut atop the country and pop charts simultaneously.

His video, "The Thunder Rolls," which deals graphically with domestic violence, was named best video of the year af-

ter, being banned as too controversial by The Nashville Network.

Female vocalist of the year Tanya Tucker was in a hospital bed when she heard she'd won after eight years of nominations. Earlier that afternoon Tucker, a single mother, gave birth to a 7-pound, 6-ounce son, Beau Grayson Tucker.

"Winning my other little award just pulled in the room," Tucker said by phone as she cut short an interview.

The message backstage from the vocal group of the year, the Kentucky Headhunters, was individuality.

The band keeps its hair long and wore blue Fluture Farmers of America jackets instead of tuxedos.

"Don't conform," said band member Richard Young. "Don't give up your personal vision."

Man of 200 voices to perform in Jackpot

JACKPOT — Rich Little is bringing George Bush, Jack Nicholson, John Wayne, Dr. Ruth, Frank Sinatra and many of the 195 other celebrities he imitates to Jackpot this weekend.

Politicians are fun to mimic because they usually have very distinct mannerisms, Little said in a telephone interview this week.

(Richard) Nixon and (Ronald) Reagan have a lot of facial expressions," he said. "Reagan has hundreds of gestures."

The Kennedys, Jimmy Carter, Hubert-Humphrey, Lyndon Johnson, Henry Kissinger and Gerald Ford are included in Little's list of political impressions.

In a June 27, 1989, nationally televised press conference from the White House, President Bush, while gesturing to the assembled media, stopped himself and said, "My goodness, I'd better watch these gestures. I'm beginning to look like Rich Little."

Little says a famous singing voice often takes less effort to imitate than a famous speaking voice.

"It's much easier to sing because you've got the tune going for you," he said.

And, sure enough, Little's repertoire is loaded with singers, such as Louis Armstrong, Eddie Arnold, Tony Bennett, Pat Boone, Johnny Cash, Nat King Cole, Perry Como, Bing Crosby, Neil Diamond, Robert Goulet, Tom Jones, Liberace, Jim Nabors, Elvis and Kenny Rogers.

Little said he has given up trying

to impersonate many of today's acting stars. Although he captures Tom Selleck, Sylvester Stallone, George C. Scott and Burt Reynolds, hundreds of others escape him.

"A lot of people I've never been able to do," Little said. "Robert Redford, Tom Hanks, Harrison Ford. Any of the new ones. They don't have distinctive voices."

He said stars of yesterday — Humphrey Bogart, Walter Brennan, Jackie Gleason, Cary Grant, Alfred Hitchcock, Boris Karloff, the Lone Ranger, Dean Martin, Rod Serling, James Stewart, Lawrence Welk — usually had voices that could be distinguished from any other.

Cartoon characters also have very distinct voices, and, from Elmer Fudd to Kermit the Frog, there aren't many that Little cannot do.

Famous news reporters are another target Little likes to include in his comedy routines on stage.

Some of the reports filed by Little's versions of David Brinkley, Howard Cosell, Walter Cronkite, Ted Koppel and Harry Reasoner would really rock the airwaves.

Richard Caruthers Little, born and raised in Ottawa, Canada, was one of three sons of a physician. He began doing impressions as a youngster, responding to the teachers' questions in their own voices.

Teaming with a friend, Little earned his first payment as an im-

pressionist at age 17. The pair won a talent contest on a Canadian television show and went on to appear on variety programs throughout Canada.

Little later went solo, becoming a disc jockey and talk-show host in Ottawa.

After continued success in Canada, Little's friend, singer Mel Torme, introduced him to the American public on "The Judy Garland Show," and Little went on to become a regular guest star on numerous variety shows on television.

"That's how I really made it in the business, was through variety shows," Little recalled. "When I started, there were about 20 on the air. Ed Sullivan, Gleason Campbell, Dean Martin, Hollywood Palace, Flip Wilson, Carol Burnett, myself, everybody had a variety show, just about."

"It's a whole different era now," he said. "Thank God I'm not starting out today or I'd never make it."

Most of the year, Little tours throughout the United States and Canada. He often appears with sym-

Little said his Jackpot show will include a film excerpt from his video called "Little Scams in Golf." "I have a video out now on how to cheat in golf," he said, advising, "Don't get caught, and if Nixon is your partner, you've got a pretty good chance of making it."

'Fisher King' a bizarre, touching movie

"The Fisher King" plays, part of the time, as though it were shot in a revolving door. It also wanders all over the place and is perhaps too long for its own good, but if you stick with it (some people did walk out midway), you won't be sorry.

Review

You should, in fact, be extremely pleased that you remained with the film, remained long enough to come away with the impression that this is a bizarre, hilarious and very touching film.

If one word can be used to describe it, it is sweet. Another is chaotic, but then it was directed by Terry Gilliam, former member of the Monty Python group, a man who has already established a reputation for directing different films ("Time Bandits," "Brazil," "Baron Munchausen").

And the performances? Well, they are only excellent. It is no surprise that Robin Williams, in his most recent role, which he does, without flaw. Jeff Bridges, on the other hand, is something of a surprise. As a burned-out radio talk-show host (fashioned after Morton Downey Jr.), he is required to perform some of the fieriest work he has done to date.

We also have Amanda Plummer as a ditzy office worker who becomes the object of Parris's affection. Parris is a street person who had been a yuppie but went a little mad when his wife was murdered by a madman who entered a restaurant and killed a number of people.

The radio man feels partly responsible. The killer had called his show, and the host was more flip than helpful.

Plummer, a difficult person to use, is perfectly cast in this instance. As the steno, she is immensely funny and extremely vulnerable. When she speaks of the man who has come her way, as one-night stands, she says, "You say you'll call, but you won't, and the next day, I will feel marvelous until the hours move along, and then I will begin to feel like dirt."

Parris may not be the man of her dreams, but he does love her, at least for the moment.

There is also Mercedes Ruehl as the woman who loves Bridges and wonders when the devil he is going

to declare himself. If Ruehl was wasted in the very recent "Another You," she is definitely not wasted in this film.

There are stand-out scenes: In one, the four principal characters eat Chinese food, and in another, a gay street person (Michael Jeter) does Ethel Merman when he pretends to be a message bearer. If you don't laugh at anything this year, you will laugh at this, and it is not because Gilliam is being condescending. He is not.

As the film reaches conclusion, Bridges dresses as a crusader and steals a cup from the home of a very

wealthy man. This is a little overdone, but remember, this is Gilliam, who once did a Python film about the search for the Holy Grail.

If you want to know how all this works, see the film, and don't be too quick to give up on it.

Homeless movie takes No. 1 box office spot

LOS ANGELES (AP) - "The Fisher King," a Hollywood allegory about a homeless man and an abrasive talk-show host, ascended to the box office throne in its first week of wide release.

Starring Robin Williams as the transient and Jeff Bridges as the fallen radio personality, "The Fisher King" grossed \$7.1 million for the top spot, according to figures released by Entertainment Data Inc.

Second place went to the new football comedy "Necessary Roughness," which made \$6.5 million.

The Golden Haven thriller "Deceived" debuted in the place with a gain of \$4.3 million. "Freddy's Dead: The Final Nightmare" slipped 48 percent from a week ago, earning \$3.4 million for fourth.

"Dead Again," actor-director Kenneth Branagh's film-within-a-film, had ticket sales of \$1.9 million for fifth place. It was followed in sixth by the time traveler story "Late for Dinner," which collected \$1.7 million.

"Terminator 2: Judgment Day" closed in on the \$200 million mark, making \$1.3 million for week

in seventh. The Arnold Schwarzenegger mayhem movie has made \$195.6 million to date.

Michael J. Fox saw his "Doc Hollywood" grab \$1.4 million for eighth place. In ninth was "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves," grossing \$1.12 million.

Rounding out the Top 10 was "Rambling Rose," starring Laura Dern. In its first week of wide release, the Southern coming-of-age story brought in \$1.11 million.

In 1949 they are a glamorous pianist and her con-man husband, today they are a woman without a memory and a feisty private investigator. DOC HOLLYWOOD (PG-13).

Twin Falls High School grad brings '60s music back home

JACKPOT—"Change is inevitable," said Gary Puckett, who went from playing guitar in a Twin Falls rock band to topping the record charts in the '60s. Some of the changes Puckett has encountered along the road have not been so pleasant.

When Puckett comes to town next week to perform at Cactus Pete's, he will, in a sense, be coming home. Minnesota-born Puckett spent his last two years of high school in Twin Falls, after his father was transferred to the area to work at C. C. Anderson (now The Bon Marche). He graduated from Twin Falls High School in 1960.

"In my senior year, I was only taking choir and two study halls. I cut every Friday to go skiing in Sun Valley," Puckett said in a telephone interview earlier this week. "The Dean of Boys (I can't remember his name, but he was tough) caught me and told me I had to stay after school every day until I made up the hours."

Puckett promptly broke his leg skiing the following weekend and was laid up at home for six weeks. "The dean was frantic, looking everywhere for me at school that Monday," said Puckett, with a laugh.

When Puckett finally did return to school, he learned to protect himself with his crutch.

"The boys would tease me constantly, pulling the snap and zipper on my pants so they would fall around my knees," Puckett said. "My crutches became an extension of my arm."

In calmer times during his Twin Falls High School days, Puckett was a guitarist in a band called The Continentals. Lead singers were Ren Wills, Darryl Amick and Paul McDonald. "We did Kingston Trio type music at school and around Filer and Buhl," Puck-

ett said. "That band was very good." When Puckett, the oldest of five children, graduated from high school, his dad was transferred to San Diego. There, Puckett attended City College for two years before he decided to pursue his love of music full time. He hit it big with his Union Gap band in 1967, and the group went full speed until the dawn of the '70s.

Gary Puckett and the Union Gap racked up hits like "Young Girl," "Lady Willpower," "Woman Woman," "Over You" and "This Girl is a Woman Now," as the band's leader struggled with a search to find some meaning in life. Puckett found that his journeys into Hinduism, Eastern mysticism and the psychedelic lifestyle did not fill his needs.

"In 1971, I gave word that it was over," said Puckett, who said he had become disenchanted with his life. "We were not selling

as much, and we were playing lousy clubs. Puckett thought he might take a little time off and then hit the road again. "But along came singers like David Bowie — and everyone wanted to forget the '60s," he said.

Puckett didn't work for eight years. Instead, he studied dance and acting and continued his search for spiritual foundation. Eventually, he began to play small clubs. And America began to experience a reawakening to '60s music.

"I helped organize the Happy Together Tour in 1984, performing with The Turtles, The Association and Spanky and Our Gang," Puckett said. "We were the first oldies tour to go out, and it was very successful."

Puckett said he became a Christian a year ago, and the pieces of his life finally fell into place. "I was an emotional wreck by that time," he said.

These days, Puckett, 48, spends a lot of time on the road with the band he organized five years ago. He owns a two-bedroom house on a gentle hill overlooking a golf course 25 miles from San Diego, and he spends his spare time playing tennis, skiing, swimming and working out in his exercise room. He is single, has no children and seldom has opportunity to visit Idaho since he no longer has family in the area.

"Puckett is disappointed in what he calls the "blatant sexuality and irresponsibility" in today's music. "I particularly oppose music that is racist or sexist," he said, "but I am glad to see us starting to bring back some beautiful music like Natalie Cole's 'Unforgettable.'"

Puckett said he would like to do an album of songs like that one someday. His major goal for the future, however, is to record an album of Christian music with his brother, David.

Puckett's current road show features rock blues, R & B, blues jazz and light shuffle. "I do some commercial fun things and some music that comes from the heart," he said, adding, "The show really rocks."

When asked if he has included his '60s hits in his '90s act, Puckett chuckled. "Are you kidding?" he said. "I would be lynched immediately after the show if I didn't do my old songs."

—Although running back Tai Gordon had a great game with 19 carries for 153 yards, this win largely came because of the Jon "Traveller" defense. Through three quarters the defense allowed Borah just two first downs and, of course, this being Twin Falls' first win also means its first shutout of the Lions.

Borah coach Wil Overgaard said later that "we could never solve the mystery of the Twin Falls defense."

"Traveller had two sacks, a fumble recovery and a blocked punt to pace the defensive effort."

"We worked real hard this week getting to read the blocks off the tackle better, step down to the dive or out for the pitch," Traveller said.

He added he felt the punt block was his all the way as "I saw as soon as I came off the line they were going to have trouble with a

low snap, and I could get to get it."

The ball rebounded through the end zone giving Twin Falls a safety in the third quarter.

"They didn't do anything different that they have done all season. We expected them to come out in the double-tight formation," Jund said.

"We had a very good overall defensive game, but our key was that our ends not let their quarterback get out on the option."

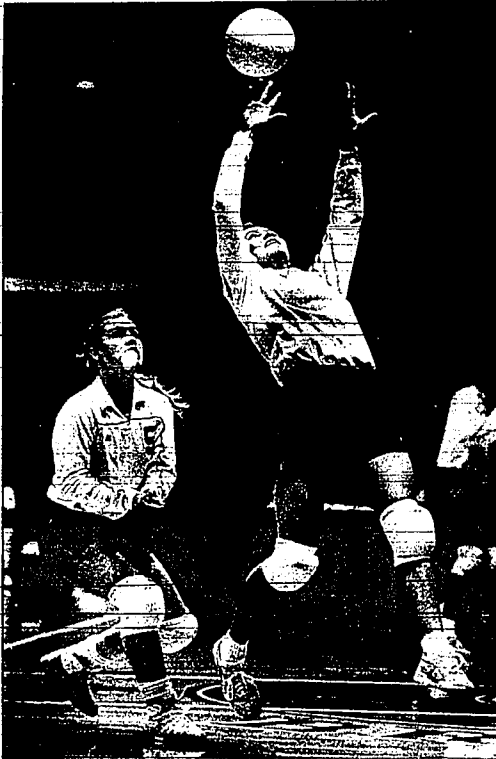

The Seminoles play No. 10 Syracuse, which beat No. 13 Florida two weeks ago and is looking for a Sunshine State sweep of sorts, and No. 7 Michigan faces Big Ten rival Iowa, ranked ninth and looking for recognition.

Florida State (4-0) beat Michigan 51-31 last Saturday and knocked the Wolverines (2-1) down three pegs from No. 4.

"We're on a mission," Florida State offensive tackle Kevin Mancini said. "We

know what it takes to win it all."

In other games involving the Top 10, it's Oklahoma State (0-3) at No. 2 Miami (3-0); Arizona (2-2) at No. 3 Washington (0-0); No. 5 Oklahoma (3-0) at Iowa State (2-2); No. 8 Clemson (3-0) at Georgia (3-1), and No. 8 Notre Dame (3-1) at Stanford (1-2).

The schedule of other ranked teams has No. 11 Baylor (4-0) at Houston (1-2); No. 12 Penn State (4-1) at Temple (1-3); No. 13 Florida (3-1) at LSU (1-2); Wisconsin (3-0) at No. 14 Ohio State (3-0); Southern Mississippi (2-2) at No. 16 Auburn (3-1), and Maryland (1-2) at No. 17 Pittsburgh (4-0).

Also: No. 18 California (3-0) at No. 24 UCLA (2-1); No. 21 Georgia Tech (2-2) at No. 19 North Carolina State (4-0); Tennessee-Chattanooga (3-1) at No. 20 Alabama (3-1); Minnesota (1-2) at No. 22 Illinois (2-1), and No. 23 Texas A&M (2-1) at Texas Tech (1-3).

The last time Florida State and Syracuse (4-0) met in 1989, the Seminoles won 41-10 at the Carrier Dome.

But things have changed a lot since then. Seven of the Orangemen's players this year were recruited from the state of Florida, including tailback Terry Richardson and cornerback Dwayne Joseph.

"They had a speed transplant since the

last time we played them," Florida State coach Bobby Bowden said.

"I know how things have been in coaching for about 40 years and there's not any substitute for winning," Iowa coach Hayden Fry said. "You go into the next week with that extra step, that extra heart beat."

Another win over Michigan would give the Hawkeyes something Fry dearly wants — recognition. "We've been the little guy — the Barney Google on the bottom," Fry said.

Top rookies not giving NFL their money's worth

The rookie class of 1991 is laughing all the way to the bank. But the 27 teams who made first-round picks back in April don't think there's anything funny about their performances.

For the first time in years, not one No. 1 pick is having an early impact. The best effort of the season was a 76-yard kickoff return by Kansas City's Harvey Williams (No. 21 overall) that set up a touchdown in a 14-13 over San Diego last week.

Consider what happened just last week:

- Antone Davis, who the Eagles got by picking away next year's No. 1 pick, allowed two sacks Monday night, got called twice for holding and once for illegal procedure.
- Jarrod Bunch, the Giants' No. 1, caught his second pass Sunday — and had it stolen by Dallas' Ray Horton, who returned it to a touchdown.
- Dan McGwire of Seattle started his first game at quarterback, went 3-for-7 with one interception and was lifted for Jeff Kemp.
- Stan Thomas of the Bears, starting at left tackle for Jimbo Covert, was called for holding twice against the Bills and lost his job to Ron-Mattes.
- On and on it goes, leaving Williams' run the top play from a

group that already has been paid about \$35 million in bonus money.

"It's not ability," says George Young, the Giants' general manager. "Many of these kids will be good players. But the agents hold them out of camp for outlandish sums and they miss so much that they, frankly, do anything the first year."

Of this year's crew, the steadiest player is probably Leonard Russell of New England, who leads the Patriots with 271 rushing yards for a 3.7 average. He's starting because veteran John Stephens was a holdout.

Mike Pritchard leads Atlanta with 19 catches, but Herman Moore of Detroit has one catch and Alvin Harper of Dallas has five catches.

And Randal Hill has five catches — but not for Miami, the team that drafted him. He was shipped off to Phoenix for a No. 1 next year.

Some are working in slowly, like the overall No. 1, Dallas' Russell Maryland, a backup defensive tackle, and the late-roper Todd Lyght of the Los Angeles Rams, who's a nickel back.

Others are injured, like the second pick, safety Eric Turner of Cleveland, and the Cardinals' Eric Swann, who had arthroscopic surgery twice on a knee, injured in minicamp and was just activated last week.

Jordan gains critics, supporters in absence at Rose Garden

Bulls begin defense of championship

As 26 of the 27 NBA teams prepare to open training camp Friday, the Chicago Bulls find themselves in an unfamiliar position: defending league champions.

"Now that we've achieved the highest point for a team, we know the challenges will be tough night after night," coach Phil Jackson said. "We are no longer the underdogs, and beginning this season, we'll have to play like it."

In order to repeat, the Bulls will have to do it with virtually the same cast as last season. Their only newcomer is rookie forward Mark Randall.

Last season, the Bulls' enjoyed their best season ever, winning a franchise-record 61 games, their second division title in team history and their first NBA championship.

They did it under the magnificent leadership of Michael Jordan. Jordan won his fifth straight scoring title with a 31.5 average, won the MVP award during the regular season and the championship series, was named to All-NBA first team for the fifth year in a row and made the All-Defensive first team for the fourth consecutive year.

Several other teams have made significant changes in hopes of overtaking Chicago.

The Los Angeles Lakers, beaten in five games in the NBA finals by Chicago, acquired super-quick guard Sedale Threatant from the Seattle SuperSonics. The Lakers were the only team to open camp

before Friday. They started Monday because they will be playing against three of Europe's top teams in the McDonald's Open Oct. 18 and 19 at Paris. The regular season begins Nov. 1.

The Detroit Pistons, two-time league champions before being succeeded by Chicago, obtained forward Orlando Woolridge from Denver and guards Darrell Walker from Washington and Jeff Martin from the Los Angeles Clippers, and signed center Brad Sellers as a free agent. They also sent forward James Edwards to the Clippers and released guard Vinnie Johnson.

"Our team will have a much different look entering the season," said coach Chuck Daly, who also will coach the 1992 U.S. Olympic team. "Over the last couple of seasons, we stressed defense to a point where we struggled to score 100 points in a game."

"Although our methodical, defensive style was very effective for us the past five seasons, it's very important that we start getting easy baskets again."

The San Antonio Spurs, last season's Midwest Division champions — the only team in the league to repeat as division winners — but eliminated in four games in the first round of the playoffs by Golden State — shored up their front line by acquiring high-scoring Antonio Carr from Sacramento for center Dwayne Schintzius.

Other teams making major moves included New York, Washington, Atlanta, Cleveland, Milwaukee, Denver, the Clippers, Phoenix and Sacramento.

CHICAGO (AP) — Michael Jordan isn't flying very high with some in the local media who are crying foul that the city's basketball hero-in-residence was a no-show at a meeting with President Bush this week.

Jordan's absence has been examined from all sides.

Some say he should be fined. Others say if Bush can golf during the Persian Gulf War, why shouldn't Jordan golf through a presidential photo opportunity?

Not that Jordan actually was playing golf. He told reporters Thursday during a team media availability that he was spending a much needed 13-day vacation with his family in North Carolina. "As you know, my schedules have been very hectic. You guys have seen me. I've been every which way, and because I choose to take my private three days somewhere no one can call me, it's my prerogative."

"How can it be disrespectful to the president when I choose to spend time with my family," said Jordan, who added that he met Bush when he was vice president.

For a while, it looked like Jordan was going to be a no-show for the media day as well. He arrived more than an hour and a half late, but said his flight was delayed. Talk swirled around what Jordan was doing before he spoke to reporters.

If Bush minded, he wasn't saying so. "Michael Jordan performs a host of good works, with a series of charities and through his foundation," Bush said.

But for local reporters, it may have represented a buy-check-in-Jordan-otherwise sterling silver armor.

The presidential snub was "about the most disturbing, irresponsible and irrational thing Jordan has ever done in public life," wrote Chicago Sun-Times columnist Jay Marini.

Marini said Chicago Bulls management should have forced Michael Jordan to show up. Because he didn't, they should fine him, as should the NBA.

A headline in Thursday's Chicago Tribune pronounced, "Snub By King Endorses Chicago Bulls' Success." Nonsense, says Tribune columnist Mike Royko. The team's meeting with Bush was "strictly political hokum arranged by the president's political propagandists." Royko wrote in Thursday's paper. "It has nothing to do with patriotism, being a good citizen or respect."

Judge pushes for settlement in Navratilova palimony suit

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — A state district judge said Wednesday he was delaying additional court-room procedures to allow time for a possible settlement of the Judy Nelson-Martina Navratilova "palimony" lawsuit.

"This saves the attorney's time and the clients money," said Judge Harry Hopkins, who agreed to suspend Monday's deadline for the latest submission of legal briefs.

Hopkins also ruled against a move by Navratilova's lawyers to try to counter-sue Nelson's lead attorney, Jeff Loflin.

Hopkins handed down his decision

in a Sept. 30 letter to the attorneys.

Nelson sued Navratilova in June, claiming half the assets earned by the nine-time Wimbledon singles champion during their 7-year relationship.

The women have said they agree on financial terms of a settlement, but remain apart on other issues, including Nelson's refusal to agree to a no-publicity clause that would stop her from selling her story.

McCurley is billing his client \$350 per hour, according to court records. Loflin is working under an agreement that would give him 40 percent of what she may receive in the case, Nelson has said.

IBM, Apple reveal details of alliance

NEW YORK (AP) — Apple and IBM have disclosed details of their historic technology-sharing alliance, designed to create a new standard for desktop computers and let software be interchanged between the two leading brands.

The accord started the computer industry when first announced three months ago, because Apple Computer Inc. and International Business Machines Corp. have competed bitterly in the increasingly cut-throat personal computer industry.

But on Wednesday, executives of the two companies patting each other's backs and joked at a San Francisco news conference, broadcast to New York and other cities via satellite.

Under the agreements signed Wednesday, the two largest personal computer makers will cooperate in five areas of computer technology.

The agreements are aimed at letting Apple's popular Macintosh computers be more easily connected to IBM models, and providing computer chips and software for next-generation desktop computers.

The agreements "will launch a renaissance in technical innovation," said John Sculley, Apple's chairman and chief executive officer.

"The (personal computer) heydays of the early 1980s will seem tame by comparison."

"With this alliance we believe we have the elements of truly a new era," said IBM President Jack Kuebler.

Industry analysts agreed the alliance was a milestone, but some questioned whether the two companies would be able to execute all their plans. The industry has a history of grand alliances that haven't always worked.

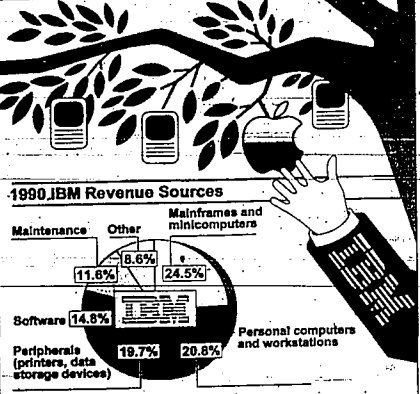
"Business-school texts will be written about it. Succeeded or failed, it's a historic agreement," said Richard Shaffer, editor and publisher of the industry newsletter ComputerLetter.

Apple and IBM will establish two joint-venture companies they will own equally.

One, called Taligent, will write new operating system software, which controls a computer's internal functions.

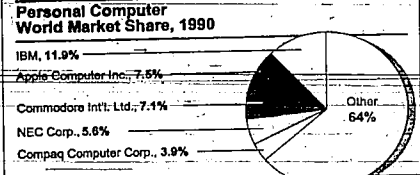
The software will be based on a new technology called "object orientation," which makes programming computers easier by allowing programmers to reuse chunks of

software code from one program to the next.

The other joint venture, called Kaleida, will develop technologies for multimedia computers, which mix text, sound and animation.

Neither company would disclose their investments in the two ventures. Each will employ several hundred people and be based in California, Apple's home state.

In addition, Apple and IBM, together with Motorola Inc., will miniaturize IBM's microprocessors, used in its computer workstations, which are powerful desktop ma-

chines that resemble personal computers.

This microprocessor, based on an advanced technology called reduced instruction set computing, or RISC, would be used in future Apple and IBM models. Microprocessors serve as the "brains" of desktop computers.

IBM and Apple also will produce new operating system software that will work on both companies' workstations.

Also as part of the agreements, Apple and IBM have licensed various technologies to each other.

Analysts say Apple and IBM entered the alliance partly because of plunging profit margins in the PC market, flooded by low-cost "clone" models and hurt by the recession.

For IBM, the agreement should lessen its reliance on computer software giant Microsoft Corp., which makes the operating system software used on almost all IBM PCs.

IBM and Microsoft had a falling out earlier this year after the two disagreed on the replacement for this operating system, called DOS.

For Apple, the pact should boost its sales to major corporations, which have been reluctant to buy machines that can't easily be linked to IBM-type computers. IBM PCs and "clone" models dominate the PC industry.

Manufactured goods orders decline

WASHINGTON (AP) — Orders for manufactured goods, unable to sustain their biggest increase in 21 years a month earlier, tumbled 1.9 percent in August, the government said Thursday.

Some analysts question whether the industrial sector can continue to lead the recovery without stronger participation by consumers, who represent two-thirds of the nation's economic activity.

"Saying the manufacturing sector will turn the economy around is like saying the tail is going to shake the dog," said economist Paul Getman of Regional Financial Associates in West Chester, Pa.

Orders for durable and non-durable goods totaled a seasonally adjusted \$243.3 billion, down from \$248.1 billion in July, the Commerce Department said.

The drop was the largest since a 2.9 percent decline in March. It followed a slightly revised 6.1 percent jump in July, the biggest since a 6.6 percent advance in December 1970. The July increase originally had been estimated at 6.2 percent.

Most analysts had expected the manufacturing sector, representing one-fourth of the nation's economic activity, to give back part of the July gain.

In another report Thursday, the Labor Department said the number of people filing initial claims for unemployment benefits dropped to 20,000 in the third week of September, down 10,000 from the previous week.

But the decline was not considered large enough to indicate any meaningful improvement in hiring practices and was not enough to offset the 37,000 surge in new claims a week earlier.

Sluggish income growth and the weak job market have been blamed for the failure of consumers to assume more of their traditional role of leading the economy out of recession.

The Commerce Department report showed that factory orders for durable goods fell 3.9 percent in August, to \$125.7 billion. The decline had been estimated at 3.8 percent.

Durable orders had soared 11.7 percent in July, the largest increase since the department began keeping records in 1958. Durable goods are usually expensive items, such as computers and cars, that are expected to last more than three years.

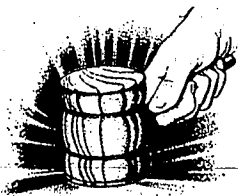
The drop more than offset a 0.3 percent gain in non-durable goods, to \$117.6 billion, down from a 0.6 percent advance a month earlier.

Inventories continued to fall, down 0.3 percent, marking the eighth decline in nine months.

The declines could mean increased production and jobs if demand increases.

Unfilled orders, often a barometer of how busy industry will be in coming months, also rose 0.3 percent, the second increase in a row.

On and off the field, Babe Ruth was America's Roaring '20s phenomenon

He was larger than life, so much so that when Japanese soldiers wanted to taunt American soldiers during World War II, they would yell, "To hell with Babe Ruth!"

During the Roaring '20s, says actor Stephen Lang, "Nobody roared louder than the Babe."

Lang has a unique perspective on the legendary New York Yankee slugger: He plays Ruth in NBC's TV movie "Babe Ruth," which airs Sunday, Oct. 6.

Ruth's achievements speak for themselves. Until Henry Aaron passed him in 1974, Ruth's 714 career home runs were the major-league record. He hit 60 homers in 1927, more than any team in the American League other than the Yankees that year, earning himself the nickname "Sultan of Swat." He was a lifetime .342 hitter who hit .625 in the 1928 World Series. Moreover, at the outset of his major-league career, he was one of the best left-handed pitchers in baseball. Most baseball historians would agree with Lang's assessment that, in the wake of the 1919 Black Sox scandal (in which eight members of the Chicago White Sox were accused of throwing the World Series to the Cincinnati Reds), "He reinvented the national pastime, and he saved the game."

Off the field, Ruth was no less a phenomenon: "His feats of drinking, womanizing, eating, all gave people tremendous vicarious experiences," says Lang. "He paid the piper in that he died relatively young, at the age of 53 (of throat cancer), but he played

the game for 21 years, in 117 (big leagues)."

"Ruth's sense of drama makes him a natural subject for a film biography. "If there was ever a player with a sense of timing and history, it was Babe Ruth," Lang observes.

With such a rich lode of lore to be mined, Hollywood has not ignored the Babe. In 1948, William Bendix starred in the title role of the highly

imaginative "Babe Ruth Story." "Babe Ruth" executive producer Lawrence Lytle says the NBC movie avoids the fanciful fictions of the 1948 film and draws heavily on the actual historical record, "jumping off from Robert Creamer's acclaimed biography "Babe: The Legend Comes to Life," and extensive research by Lytle, Lang and producer Frank Pace, dedicated baseball fans all.

"The film covers the period

between 1920 and 1935," says Lytle.

"We felt he really lived and died (in the time between his arrival in New York in 1920 and when he retired from baseball in 1935)."

Lang, who played baseball as a kid and in high school, even learned to hit left-handed for the film. "It was, the actor notes, the hardest thing about the role.

Lang found it much easier to put on an additional 35 pounds to simulate the Babe's chunky upper-body. Taking it off, he says, is a more laborious process, but he has to for his next role: He will play Hamlet on Broadway this winter.

Monday night sitcoms help CBS clinch 2nd week of fall season

LOS ANGELES (AP) — CBS earned its second consecutive victory in the 2-week-old fall season, thanks again to a blockbuster Monday night lineup flanked by "Murphy Brown" and "Designing Women."

Every comedy series on CBS' Monday schedule landed in the top 10 program list, according to ratings released Tuesday by the A.C. Nielsen Co.

CBS, which finished third last season, won the week with a 13.4 average rating. ABC was second with 12.5 and usually first-place NBC was third with 12.3.

Each ratings point represents 921,000 homes.

ABC's "Roseanne" was the most-watched show on television. The blue-collar comedy starring Roseanne Arnold pulled in 19.7 million households, or 32 percent of the television audience, with an episode that saw program characters Roseanne and Dan leaving teen-age daughter Becky in charge at home while the couple ran their new business.

For the second week in a row, ABC had the only new series in the top 20. "Home Improvement," star-

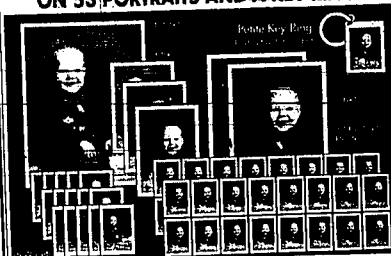

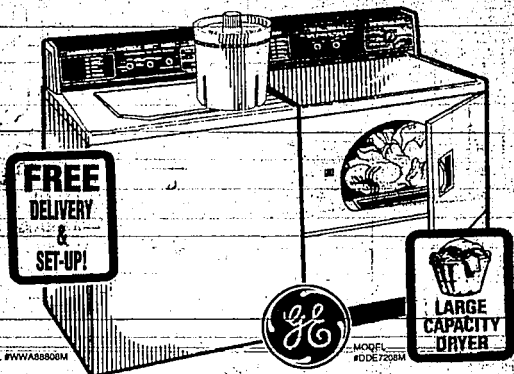
