# Scary photos, no Bush trophies

TOKYO — President Bush left Washington in search of political trophies for his "jobs, jobs, jobs" trade mission to Japan. He's going home with a scrapbook of ghoulish pictures that will be remembered far longer than the loosely worded promises he won.

In the election-year battlefields of New Hampshire and beyond, Bush will have a difficult time convincing voters that he accomplished much in Tokyo to beat down the U.S. recession and put Americans back to work. Even Bush's traveling cheering squad — a high-ranking group of

American business executives — was disgruntled after acrimonious talks to set higher targets for Japanese purchases of American autos and parts. Ford Motor Co. chairman Harold A. Posing said he would have been pleased with a Japanese commitment in specific terms to reducing its huge trade surplus with the United States.

## Fingers point as mission ends

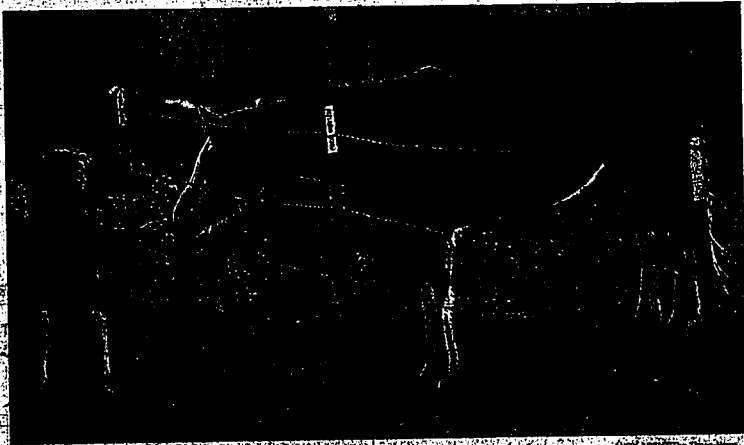
TOKYO — President Bush's trade mission to Japan ended Thursday in a final round of finger-pointing. American automakers were unhappy with vague trade pledges, while the Japanese said the White

House was making their nation a scapegoat for America's inability to cure its own economic ills. Bush, departed for the United States Friday morning, joined Prime Minister Kichii Miyazawa in an upbeat concluding declaration. But smiles were scarce away from the formalities.

After the talks ended, U.S. automakers complained that more U.S. cars per year, to double purchases of U.S. auto parts, to relax car inspection standards and boost sales of other goods weren't nearly enough.

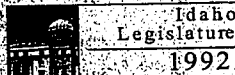
# Legislators less optimistic about Gem revenue prospects for coming year

BOISE — A special legislative committee wrapped up hearings on the state's economic future Thursday, many convinced Gov. Cecil Andrus' extremely tight 1993 state budget is based on an overly optimistic forecast. "We're not going to be near the governor's," Sen. Lee Staker, R-Idaho Falls, said. "It's going to be real tough."

The governor's new budget for the year beginning July 1 contemplates the state tax system producing \$1.017 billion, an increase of 6.3 percent over the current year.

Although Idaho's economy has continued growing while the rest of the nation struggled with recession, financial



their assessment of the next 18 months indicated the slowdown in growth would not be as significant as other experts had predicted. Instead of anticipating personal income in the state to grow at less than 6 percent as many others have, the administration projected increases in excess of 6 percent and averaging 7 percent when farm income was excluded. But committee members appeared more concerned about warnings from several private economists that Idaho's luck in staying out of the national recession could run out by midyear if the overall economy does not begin a recovery by then. The panel will meet next Tuesday to come up with a revenue estimate that will guide budget deliberations this winter.

## Ex-KGB agent claims to have JFK evidence

MOSCOW — A retired KGB agent claimed Thursday he has new information about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and urged the creation of a Joint Russian-U.S. investigatory commission. "What happened in the United States of America in 1963 is not only a (unsolved) element of American history, but... a gap in world history," said Oleg M. Nechiporenko, a senior agent who was thrown out of Mexico in 1971 for purportedly scheming to topple the government. Nechiporenko refused to give details and suggested he expected to be paid for the information, which he

called a "commercial secret" that will be disclosed in a certain way. "Nuclear broke" came into the limelight last week when former KGB Maj. Gen. Oleg Kalugin, an outspoken critic of the KGB, said Nechiporenko interrogated Americans in Vietnam who might have been prisoners of war long after Vietnam said it had sent all Americans home. Nechiporenko said Thursday he had interviewed only one American, a suspected CIA agent, in 1973. ## Heavy equipment operator crushed against Milner Dam ice

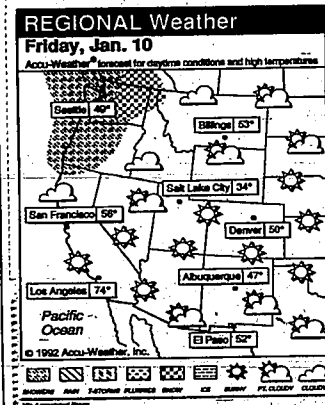
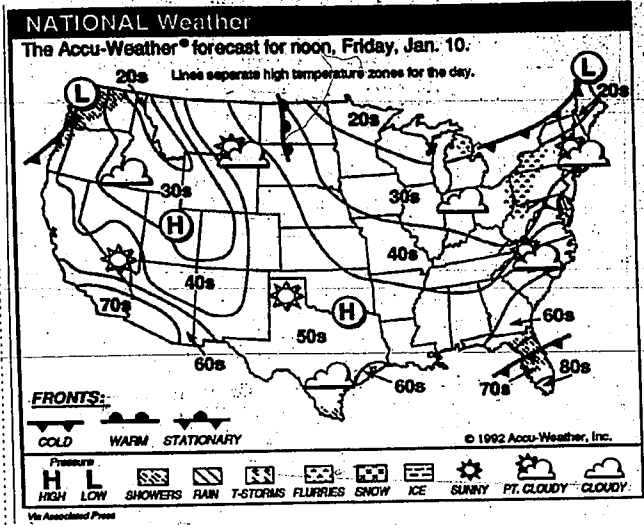

MURTAUGH — A California man died Thursday morning after the Caterpillar earth-moving machine he was operating plunged into the Big Snake River near Milner Dam, crushing him against the ice. Mike Torrans, 29, of Oakdale, Calif., was building a pad for a dirt rig when the front of the Caterpillar slipped into the water, Twin Falls Deputy Sheriff Jim Clawson said. Torrans had just climbed out of the Caterpillar and was standing on the machine's door panel when the ice broke, sending the multi-ton rig into the water, Twin Falls County Coroner Cal Edwards said. Torrans was pinned between the door of

the Caterpillar and the machine's superstructure, Edwards said, crushing his back, severing some major arteries and puncturing his lungs. Torrans' body was recovered after nearly an hour in the water. There was no water in his lungs, Edwards said, indicating that he was killed instantly. Torrans was working for Ames Construction Co. of Burnsville, Minn., on a project to install a power plant at Milner Dam. Rescue units from Cassia County, Jerome County and Twin Falls County were dispatched, Clawson said. The incident occurred at 11:40 a.m. and divers from Cassia County recovered the body at 12:45 p.m.

## Weather summary

The National Weather Service says Idaho remained under a ridge of high pressure and was between weather systems Thursday.

The last disturbance to pass through the area moved well to the southeast, and the next incoming storm was lying off the Washington-Oregon coastline.

Oswald requested Soviet citizenship in 1959 and lived in the Soviet Union in the early 1960s. After the assassination, the KGB claimed it had rejected Oswald as an agent and blocked his efforts to return to the Soviet Union.

Nechiporenko told a news conference Thursday he and two other agents met Oswald on Sept. 27-28, 1963, at the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City, where Oswald was trying to get a visa to re-enter the Soviet Union.

Nechiporenko would say only that he had "historical information" that would "be useful for the analysis of what happened" on Nov. 22 when Oswald shot Kennedy.

"If I gave it out now, it would be unfair to the other people who took part and it would be premature."

There was no immediate way to verify Nechiporenko's claim to have met Oswald in Mexico City. The KGB and Soviet Foreign Ministry could not be reached for comment.

Nechiporenko is known to have been active as a spy in Mexico in this period. He said he was twice posted at the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City, from 1961 to 1965 and from 1967 until his expulsion. He later was sent to Vietnam.

Nechiporenko said he was considering writing a book or producing a documentary about his KGB experiences.

He said his name never came up in connection with the assassination because Oswald never used it during bugged telephone conversations. Oswald spent days in Mexico City trying to get visas from Cuban or Soviet diplomats, who reportedly were unwilling to refuse.

Oswald eventually gave up and returned to the United States.

# Reject GATT terms, groups ask

WASHINGTON (AP) — A coalition of 28 environmental and consumer groups on Thursday urged Congress and President Bush to reject the pending General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade. In addition, the groups said the GATT agreement negotiated during

international trade talks in Uruguay "undermines environmental and consumer protection in the U.S. and across the world."

Among those signing the letter were Greenpeace, the Sierra Club and Ralph Nader's Public Citizen organization.

The indictment says Manuel Salinas and his organization distributed more than 66 pounds of cocaine in the Burley and Twin Falls areas during a seven-month period, in addition to distribution in other areas of Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Nevada.

Within minutes of Bush's announcement of the details, the automakers who accompanied him voiced their unhappiness. Chrysler Chairman Lee Iacocca said the agreement "doesn't sound like a lot of cars."

"The bad news is that I think the proposals that are on the table as far as the auto industry is concerned are inadequate," added Harold A. Poling, chairman of Ford Motor Co.

Back in the United States, Bush Majority Leader Richard Gephardt,

D-Mo., a frequent critic of administration trade policy, said the effectiveness of Bush's trip would be known until later. Gephardt, touring General Motors plants in Ohio, asked, "Will they really allow us to sell our auto parts to their manufacturers? Will they really allow us to sell our cars made in the United States in their market?"

Bush has linked the recession to General trade practices, which he says restrict imports and therefore cost Americans their jobs.

But as his trade mission neared an end Thursday, both he and Miyazawa emphasized the positive.

In a joint declaration, they said they agreed that "economic issues have assumed new prominence ... in the post-Cold War era."

In a written statement, Bush and Miyazawa said they were resolved to "enhance openness and oppose protectionism in their commercial, financial and investment markets."

Bush said the two sides had agreed on 11 arrangements to increase U.S. exports of autos, paper, glass and semiconductors to

Japan. He described the package as "significant but certainly not the end of the road."

The president stressed the importance of a Japanese government pledge to buy American computers.

The two leaders also supported the idea of a rising value for the yen against the dollar, which would help U.S. goods cheaper here. And they concluded a joint "strategy for world growth," designed to strengthen the global economy.

Bush and Miyazawa, both needing to make the best of a long-awaited state visit marred by the president's bout with the flu, said their meetings had reaffirmed the sometimes tense alliance between the two economic superpowers.

Bush said American military ties with Japan will remain strong, and the Japanese would continue to permit U.S. goods cheaper here. And he also said post-Cold War cooperation with Japan was essential.

But it was made that Bush came to Japan to talk about, and the results on that score were ambiguous.

# Study: Other factors can harm heart

NEW YORK (AP) — People with normal cholesterol levels and high amounts of blood fats may be four times as likely as others to suffer a heart attack, and could be wrongly given a clean bill of health, researchers say.

Researchers said that many doctors do not understand the significance of elevated levels of the blood fats called triglycerides. As a result, many people with normal cholesterol levels are not identified as having special risks.

Nevertheless, the study found that these people should be identified and treated. "This population had the greatest risk and the greatest benefit," said the study's director, M. Heikki Frick of the Helsinki University Central Hospital in Finland.

People whose total level of blood cholesterol contained a high proportion of so-called "bad cholesterol" and who had high triglyceride levels were 3.8 times as likely as others to have a heart attack, Frick said in a telephone interview Thursday. This is true even in people whose total cholesterol is normal or only

## Blood tests can detect problem

NEW YORK (AP) — Measurements of total cholesterol are one indicator of heart disease risk, but measurements of triglycerides and the good and bad forms of cholesterol can better determine a patient's risk, doctors say.

Treatment of high levels of bad cholesterol, or LDLs, differs from treatment for high levels of slightly elevated, he said. The study appears in January's issue of *Circulation*, published by the American Heart Association. The study also showed that the heart attack risk could be cut 71 percent by lowering triglyceride levels and raising the levels of "good cholesterol," otherwise known as high-density lipoproteins, or HDLs.

triglycerides, said Dr. William Castelli, director of the Framingham Heart Study in Framingham, Mass. "Both HDLs (good cholesterol) and triglycerides should be measured when the risk is assessed," said Heikki Frick of the Helsinki University Central Hospital in Finland.

The bad cholesterol — LDLs, or low-density lipoproteins — have been known to be associated with heart disease risk. The higher the LDLs, the higher the risk. Rises in HDLs, on the other hand, have been linked with lower heart disease risk, but until now, the link has not been clearly demonstrated, said Dr. William Castelli, director of the Framingham Heart Study in Framingham, Mass. "This is the first proof in the history of medicine that if you raise

HDL you lower the subsequent heart attack risk," he said. Frick said about 10 percent of Americans with high cholesterol probably would have the combination of high triglycerides and a high proportion of bad cholesterol in their bloodstreams.

He and Castelli said many Americans with normal or only slightly elevated cholesterol also are likely to have the same risky combination. "It turns out they're very common," Castelli said. "They account for twice as many heart attacks as any other group."

Many of these people have cholesterol levels in the normal range, between 150 and 200, or in the slightly elevated range of 200 to 250, Castelli said. "They are being missed in American medicine, because they have a high triglyceride level, which doctors aren't sure are a risk factor," Castelli said.

Castelli said people with HDL levels below 40 and triglyceride levels over 150 should be considered at high risk, even if their cholesterol levels are normal.

## Subic sailors may be headed to Guam

WASHINGTON — The Navy tentatively plans to shift 2,550 personnel and their families from Subic Bay Naval Base in the Philippines to Guam 1,700 miles to the east, a Pentagon official said Thursday.

It would be the latest step by the Pentagon to spread its operations from one of the world's great naval ports to other parts of the Pacific in support of the 7th Fleet.

One Navy group that is part of the plan would operate out of Andersen airfield. It is an aerial-support squadron that flies parts, secures and mails to ships at sea. Others include a SEAL unit of the Navy's elite special forces fighters; explosives disposal experts, and personnel for a supply depot, ship repairs, a hospital and aircraft maintenance.

Quayle says banks hurt U.S. economy  
LINCOLN, N.H. — Vice President Dan Quayle, defending Bush administration economic policies to skeptical New Hampshire voters, on Thursday blamed banks for contributing to the recession and prodded them to make more loans.

The vice president accused banks and other financial institutions of hiding behind secure Treasury bills when they should be making more loans to small businesses. On a whirlwind bus tour of small villages in the nation's leadoff primary state, Quayle also defended President Bush's trip to Japan against suggestions that it had not produced breakthroughs on trade.

President says he's eager for campaign.  
TOKYO — President Bush on Thursday sought to allay concerns prompted by his bout with the stomach flu, saying "all signals are still go" for his re-election campaign.

The president also predicted there would be a backlash against Democratic presidential hopefuls if they tried to make an issue of his health or age. He was heading home Friday to focus on unemployment and the U.S. recession, which he says have been caused in part by the nation's trade imbalance with Japan.

Shuttle launch set for later this month  
CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — NASA has chosen Jan. 22 for the year's first space shuttle launch, a week-long scientific research mission involving foreign astronauts. Mission managers set the launch date following a meeting at Kennedy Space Center on Thursday.

Discovery is scheduled to blast off at 8:53 a.m. EST with seven astronauts. The crew includes a German physicist who flew in space once before and a neurologist who will become the second Canadian — and the first Canadian woman — to venture into orbit.

# Researchers say cystic fibrosis treatment should work

WASHINGTON (AP) — Researchers say they may have found a way to treat cystic fibrosis, a disease that has always been fatal. If the genetic therapy works in monkeys, human tests will start soon.

Patients might simply use inhalers to get the genetically altered cold virus into their lungs and reverse the abnormalities that cause the disease. But it's not known how long the treatment is effective, and patients may have to repeat it periodically.

"It would not be a one-time cure, but the strategy is a cure," said Dr. Ronald Crystal, head

of the research team at the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute.

So far, the researchers have successfully used the method in test tubes and have tried it on rats. The results are being published Friday in the scientific publication *Cell*.

"I have no doubt that if we were to do the same now in a person with cystic fibrosis that we could reverse the abnormalities in the lung," Crystal said in an interview.

Cystic fibrosis, an inherited disorder that affects some 40,000 people in the United States, causes the lungs to produce a thick mucus that

eventually damages the lungs and leads to respiratory failure and death. The average age at death is 27, Crystal said.

Until recently, little could be done for cystic fibrosis patients except to help them cough the mucus out of their lungs.

But there are new treatments that alter or reduce the secretions in the lungs, said Dr. Robert J. Beall, executive vice president for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.

Crystal's approach represents the first attack on the underlying genetic cause of cystic fibrosis, Beall said.

# Move restricts logging to protect owl

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government Thursday restricted logging on 6.9 million acres of forest it considers critical to the survival of the northern spotted owl.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service said failure to restrain logging of the owl's old-growth habitat immediately could lead to its extinction.

The agency predicts that overall efforts to save the owl will cost about 33,000 Northwest jobs, but said many of those jobs would be lost anyway because of the market forces.

"We recognize the profound impact of potential job losses and have sought to balance between the interests of people and wildlife," said Fish and Wildlife Service Director John Turner.

Timber industry backers called the plan excessive and say it will cost more jobs than the government predicts.

Mark Rey, director of the industry's American Forest Resource Alliance, said the plan constitutes "a legal overreach on the entire region by an out-of-control federal agency."

Environmentalists said the new habitat boundaries are inadequate to ensure the owl's survival and will allow half the estimated remaining 3,000 pairs of the bird to die.

"The political influence of the timber industry seems to have been brought to bear on the Fish and Wildlife Service because the final proposal is 40 percent smaller than the original proposal," said Richard Hoppe, a spokesman for The Wilderness Society.

The consequence is a probable loss of 50 percent of the owl population and further destruction of irreplaceable ancient forests — an internationally recognized ecosystem," he said.

The government declared the owl a threatened species in 1990, blaming years of excessive logging for a dramatic decline in the centuries-old stands of trees.

"It is estimated the current rate of harvest would liquidate most remaining old-growth in 15 to 30 years," the service said in a summary of its designation of critical habitat.

The habitat boundaries announced Thursday came under a federal court order won by environmentalists in April. The area is made up entirely of federally owned forests in Oregon, Washington and northern California.

# FBI assigns agents to gangs' trails

## McNamara partly blames Cuba for crisis

WASHINGTON (AP) — The FBI will reassign 300 agents now chasing spies to investigate street gangs in major cities plagued by an upsurge in violent crime, Attorney General William P. Barr said Thursday.

The dissolution of the Soviet Union and the demise of Communist regimes in Eastern Europe will allow the largest reallocation of FBI manpower in the bureau's history, Barr said.

"Some of the intelligence services that used to operate against the United States are no longer in existence," Barr said. "The very substantial resources we are keeping in counterintelligence work are fully sufficient to protect the national security interests of the United States," he said.

The 300 agents will be redeployed to help authorities in 39 cities investigate street gangs blamed for the rising tide of drug killings and drive-by shootings in recent years.

The Bush administration will propose transferring more counterintelligence agents to violent crime investigations in its fiscal 1993 budget, which will soon be sent to Congress, Barr said.

## U.S. seeks talks on nuclear arms

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a move to safeguard such weapons, the Bush administration is sending a high-level delegation to the four former Soviet republics where long-range nuclear missiles are stockpiled.

The delegation will be headed by Under Secretary of State Regina Bartholomew. The State Department announced Thursday.

The group will hold talks on controlling exports of weapons and nuclear technology; the department said. It also will discuss ways to disarm and dismantle the thousands of missiles due to be withdrawn under U.S.-Soviet treaties and unilateral pledges by former Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev.

There are more than 17,000 long-range nuclear warheads in Russia, 4,300 in Ukraine, 1,600 in Kazakhstan and 1,200 in Belarus.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Former Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara said Thursday in a speech prepared for delivery in Havana that Cuban officials were wrong 30 years ago in assuming the United States was inflexibly opposed to Cuba's revolution.

McNamara said the United States was willing to work with the Cuban revolution but was unable to do so because of President Fidel Castro's efforts to promote subversion in the Western Hemisphere and his intimate ties to the Soviet Union.

The long-held Cuban view is that the United States never accepted the reality of the Cuban revolution for ideological reasons.

McNamara, 75, outlined his views at the opening of a four-day meeting of dozens of Americans, Soviets and Cubans who were part of the Cuban missile crisis 29 years ago. Castro

was scheduled to take part in each of the four days of the conference. As President Kennedy's defense secretary, McNamara was a key figure in both the April 1961 Bay of Pigs invasion and the missile crisis 18 months later.

In his prepared remarks, McNamara said the United States wanted a detailed explanation from Cuba of its alleged subversive activities in Latin America. McNamara said Cuba had targeted dictatorships and democracies alike in its pursuit of revolution in the hemisphere.


He also said the U.S. delegation wants to know what Castro meant by a quote attributed to him in June 1958, six months before the revolution.

According to McNamara, Castro is reported to have said that, after his forces took power, "a much bigger

and greater war will start for me — war I shall launch against them (the United States). I realize that this will be my true destiny."

Suggesting that Cuba was responsible for tensions leading up to the missile crisis, McNamara said Castro rejected U.S. overtures of peaceful coexistence that dated back to the earliest days of the revolution.

## Andrus administration begins tough sales job on 'tight' budget

BOISE (AP) — The Andrus administration on Thursday began trying to sell the governor's tight 1993 state spending blueprint to legislative budget-writers only to see its cornerstone education initiative come under quick attack.

House Appropriations Chairman Kathleen Gurnsey, R-Boise, immediately told administration Budget Director Charles Moss that the governor's Strong Start program for elementary school children will find itself competing with the education reform proposal State Schools Superintendent Jerry Evans delivers next week.

"The obvious political reality of this, is we're not going to have the money," Gurnsey said. "We're either going to have to put the money here and take it away from the Department of Education or put in the Department of Education."

The Strong Start program, aimed at ensuring children are ready to learn when the go to school and involving

parents in their education, calls for \$5 million to underwrite innovation in education through pilot programs at specific schools.

Only one school in any district will receive support in the first stage of Strong Start, Moss said, but "we think if we target certain schools that we want to participate and they work, we can expand it to all schools."

But Appropriations Vice Chairman Bob Geddes, R-Preston, objected to any program that would not provide financial support to all the schools in the state.

"One thing is clear," Moss admitted later, "we've got a job to do to sell

some of the governor's programs like Strong Start."

Republican legislative leaders were questioning all the initiatives within minutes after Gov. Cecil Andrus proposed them on Wednesday, maintaining the tight budget situation did not justify new spending.

"I see some problems for the new programs," the governor's brought forth, House Speaker Tom Boyd, R-Coeuse, said. "In a frugal year, everyone is going to have to take their lumps together."

The governor's budget calls for an overall increase in general tax spending of 2.6 percent in the year beginning

July 1. That produces the state's first budget over \$1 billion, but demands prudence, treasury have escalated more rapidly than the tax revenues even. Idaho's relatively strong state economy can produce.

To maintain his pledge that there would be no election-year tax increase, Andrus actually reduced spending in the new budget from this year for 22 of 46 state agencies and except for a handful like public schools the others received only modest increases.

The biggest spending increase went to the Department of Health and Welfare where federal mandates have driven costs up dramatically.

Joe Nagel, director of the department's Division of Environmental Quality, warned the budget panel that if it fails to provide the cash needed to meet federal deadlines on air quality, the state could lose over \$100 million in federal highway funds.

If the state does not set up the program to oversee new federal solid waste disposal regulations, Nagel said Idaho's counties will simply be forced to adopt the most expensive compliance methods. He said while there was no financial repercussions from allowing the federal government to continue overseeing clean drinking water regulations in the state, Nagel warned in the long-run water quality in Idaho's small towns will decline and the "public will suffer."

### House committee declines extension of property tax break

BOISE (AP) — In a legislative session filled with talk of tax cuts, a House committee declined its first opportunity to trim property taxes Thursday.

The House Revenue and Taxation Committee declined to print and introduce a proposal from Rep. Larry Vincent, D-Caldwell, to cut property taxes \$1.8 million by expanding the "circuit breaker" property tax exemption.

The exemption trims property taxes by up to \$400 for low-income people who qualify — people age 65 or older, blind, disabled and certain veterans. It's phased out as income rises, with anyone showing household in-

come of \$8,750 or more ineligible.

Vincent proposed doubling the top amount to \$800 and boosting the income level to \$16,500.

State tax laws allow automatic increases in the qualifying income levels, as federal poverty guidelines are modified.

But at the request of committee members, Vincent took his proposal back for more work.

Rep. Steve Anione, R-Rupert, chairman of Revenue and Taxation, said he would assign the Vincent proposal to a subcommittee headed by Rep. Mike Simpson, R-Blackfoot, for revisions.

### False death report lands caller in ward

BOISE (AP) — A man was being held in a Boise mental hospital Thursday after allegedly calling CNN Headline News and reporting that President Bush had died at a banquet in Japan.

The Atlanta-based cable-TV network came within seconds of airing the report Wednesday before an editor realized it was a hoax.

A caller identifying himself as Bush's personal physician telephoned CNN about three hours after the president collapsed from stomach flu, and said the president was dead. The number the alleged caller left with CNN was traced to Idaho, where the man was arrested.

CNN Headline News anchorman Don Harrison started to read the report on the air at 9:45 a.m. EST Wednesday during coverage of Bush's collapse, when he was alerted by another staff member, CNN spokesman Steve Haworth said.

In the Boise suburb of Garden City where the call was traced, Police Chief Willard Heaps said James Edward Smith, 71, was arrested after police received reports that he had called CNN and a number of federal agencies, claiming to be Bush's doctor.

"We kept getting calls from the people he was calling," Heaps said.

Smith complained in many of the calls about being arrested Tuesday night in Garden City for driving without a license or vehicle registration, Heaps said. But it was unclear whether Smith made the claim about the president having died in any call besides the one to CNN.

In Washington, a Secret Service official who spoke on condition of

anonymity said agents interviewed the man, but he was not charged with any federal violation.

Headline News, a sister service of CNN, features condensed versions of CNN reports.

CNN and Headline News are two floors apart but use the same newsroom computer system. A staff member, whom Haworth would not identify, had typed the telephoned report into the computer.

Haworth would not discuss CNN procedures for handling a bulletin of such magnitude.

But he said the network is reinforcing existing checklists requiring that senior staff members be notified about important bulletins being put into the computer.

CNN executives determined almost immediately that the report was a fake and it was not used. "As soon as we determined it to be a hoax, we took it out of the computer file," Haworth told The Atlanta Constitution.

But downstairs at Headline News, it nearly was broadcast.

Haworth said the caller left an Idaho telephone number, and the CNN called the number back. The network did not reach the man on that return call.

Heaps said Smith was taken to a Boise hospital rather than being booked into the Ada County jail after his arrest Tuesday night because he feigned a heart attack.

The hospital released him after finding no medical problem, Heaps said, and he began "making calls." Smith feigned "another heart attack" when officers arrested him later Wednesday.

### Bear Lake dispute settled

PARIS (AP) — Bear Lake County commissioners will accept \$100,000 and hold mortgages on property to settle a long-standing tax dispute with owners of Bear Lake West II, a 4,000-acre recreational project.

The project, on the shores of Bear Lake, offers home sites, tennis courts, a nine-hole golf course, lodge and swimming pool. It has been embroiled in legal battles since the early '80s.

Jerry Willmore, Salt Lake City businessman who took over the bankrupt project in 1983, and his partner Ron Lofthouse were pleased the commissioners accepted the

deal. They refinanced the project to pay off the taxes.

They will pay the county \$100,000 immediately and the remaining \$35,000 in five payments beginning in February 1993.

Commissioner Ron Law objected to the agreement. He said he doesn't want the county holding mortgages on property.

### Briefly

#### Craig: INEL summit soon in coming

BOISE — U.S. Sen. Larry Craig was confident on Thursday that the summit between Gov. Cecil Andrus and Deputy Energy Secretary Henson Moore on the future of the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory will occur later this month.

"We're in the final days of trying to put that together," Craig said after discussing the prospects for the Jan. 22 meeting with state lawmakers.

"I'm very optimistic," he said. "I have yet to have either party tell me, 'No, heck no, we will not attend.'"

Craig has been trying to set up a meeting between Andrus and top Energy Department officials since mid-November after a federal judge blocked further shipments of high-level radioactive material from Colorado to Idaho until they comply with state air quality laws.

#### After release, sheriff arrested again

CALDWELL — Idaho County Sheriff Randy Baldwin was arrested on federal charges Thursday as he was being released from the Canyon County jail after pleading innocent to burglarizing a Nampa home for cash and drugs.

U.S. Attorney Maurice Ellsworth said Baldwin is charged with conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute marijuana or cocaine, possession with intent to distribute cocaine or marijuana, and using or carrying a firearm in the commission of each crime.

An initial appearance and separate detention hearing for Baldwin were scheduled Friday before U.S. Magistrate Mikel Williams.

#### Court rejects appeal from Vietnamese

BOISE — The Court of Appeals has rejected a claim from an Ada County Vietnamese that he didn't get fair treatment in the Idaho court system because of his difficulties with English.

The court on Thursday upheld the prison sentence of five to 15 years ordered for Trung Quang Nguyen after he pleaded guilty to robbery. In a petition for post-conviction relief, Trung claimed that because of difficulties in communicating with his lawyer, he didn't get effective representation.

But the Court of Appeals said District Judge Robert Newhouse held a hearing at which it was determined that Trung had a fair oral and written knowledge of English and that his counsel had advised him several times, he could have an interpreter if he wanted.

#### Crane hoists worker to view damage

BOISE — On Saturday, a crane will hoist an engineer up to inspect the sandstone facing of the Statehouse, damaged by a New Year's Day fire.

"We need to find out if we have sandstone so badly fractured we're going to have to get it out right away," Public Works Director Anne Barker said Thursday. The second-floor offices of Attorney General Larry Echo Hawk and eight offices of the Legislative Budget Office on the third floor directly above were damaged by fire.

## Study says northern California vulnerable to major earthquake

WASHINGTON (AP) — The northern California coast could be hit with a major earthquake, measuring up to 9.0 on the Richter scale, according to new research that bolsters theories that the area is vulnerable to major tremors.

That large an earthquake could cause severe damage and trigger a tsunami, a huge sea wave that could strike coastal communities unprepared for such a disaster.

Recent studies have focused attention on a 1,000-mile-long area from British Columbia to far northern California that had not been thought to be at high risk for major earthquakes.

In an article appearing today that details his study of the area, Samuel H. Clarke Jr. reports that the region has the potential to produce an earthquake measuring 8.4 to 9.0 on the Richter scale.

## Pastor jumps bail, heads back to jail

KENNEWICK, Wash. (AP) — Baptist pastor Ed Lopes, who claimed to be a reformed Mafia hit man but was actually a parole-jumping wife killer, was returned to jail Thursday after a judge determined he may be a flight risk.

Lopes was unmasked as a fugitive last week. He had fled parole in Illinois after serving prison time for murdering his wife and leaving a girlfriend for dead. He now is a suspect in a death in a death in Brockton, Mass.

"We think there is an incentive for him to flee," Benton County Prosecutor Andy Miller said.

Court Commissioner Bill Platts agreed, revoking Lopes' \$50,000 bail and ordering him to jail for two weeks until his next extradition hearing.

Larry Stephenson, Lopes' lawyer, argued that his client was willing to return to Illinois on charges of being a fugitive from justice and that if he planned to flee he would have already done so.

Lopes, 56, dressed in a gray suit and pink tie, did not comment and was whisked out of the courtroom. His wife, Joan, also refused comment.

Miller said circumstances had changed since Lopes was first granted bail.

The most dramatic change was that Brockton police reopened the 1966 death of Helen Hansen. She initially was thought to have died of acute alcoholism. She was Lopes' girlfriend at the time. "During the courtship, she said Wednesday, the couple's favorite activity was "driving around Arizona and seeing his favorite places."

The wedding probably will take place at Goldwater's home in Paradise Valley, Wechsler said. But she said they haven't decided where they will live, noting that she has a house of her own.

Goldwater declined to talk to the media about his engagement. "I guess he's just enjoying being in love," said his secretary, Doris Berry.

A subduction zone quake along the northern coastal area could cause a tsunami more than 30 feet high.

"As to when (such an earthquake might occur), I can't really say. We don't really have enough evidence to be predictive in this sense," Clarke said.

The interval between earthquakes in northern California ranges from about 90 years to 550 years, he said.

Clarke and Carver used fossil trees and mollusk shells in their study, which centered on northern California because most of the length of the subduction zone lies off shore and can't be examined directly. Carver's wife, Deborah, contributed oral Indian histories that include stories of water rising, ocean creatures left inland and canoes found in trees.

"It is interesting. We certainly don't want to discount it," Clarke said about the Indian legends, although noting there's no time element in the stories that could link them with a specific earthquake.

The Richter scale is a measure of the strength of an earthquake as recorded by the ground motion. Each increase of one whole number indicates a ten-fold increase in the strength of the quake.

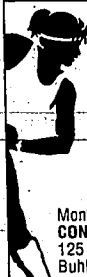

### Tougher NCAA rules for eligibility makes sense

The National Collegiate Athletic Association came to a novel conclusion this week: Athletes who play intercollegiate sports ought first to be students. NCAA schools, over the bitter objection of black educators charging discrimination, voted Wednesday for the toughest academic standards in the history of college sports.

Drawn up and championed by the reform-minded NCAA Presidents' Commission, the new rules will strengthen both freshman eligibility requirements and the standards athletes must meet beyond their freshman years. Currently, freshmen can be eligible for sports if they have a 2.0 grade-point average — a "C" — in 11 college preparatory or "core" high school courses and attain a score of 700 on the Scholastic Aptitude Test and 17 on the American College Test.

Under the new rules, the number of core courses was raised to 13, adding English, math and science, and the GPA was raised from 2.0 to 2.5.

Black educators complain that the standardized test scores used to determine freshman eligibility are racially and culturally discriminatory, and the president of Delaware State University says the new rules will eliminate 20 percent of black athletes.

We doubt that, but it's beside the point. A lower standard intended for black and other minority student-athletes is inherently racist, and serves only to hurt those whom it is intended to help.

Too many colleges use up athletes' eligibility and then discard them, depriving them of the education that is the stated purpose of intercollegiate sports.

Whatever their color, kids who don't

qualify for college academically should not qualify for college athletically.

Let's be honest: It doesn't take a Rhodes scholar to score a 700 on the SAT or to pull a 2.5 GPA in high school. All the new rules say is that if you don't meet certain minimum academic standards, you must spend your freshman year honing your verbal and math skills instead of your jump shot.

The mission of college athletic departments is not remedial education, but that's what it amounts to at many schools.

Proposition 48, the current NCAA rule on freshman eligibility, keeps one student-athlete in six off the field during his freshman year, and discourages colleges from recruiting many others.

Some of them never go to college. Others end up in junior colleges. Whatever the case, they must demonstrate before they can carry a football that they can carry a course load.

Once upon a time, that was the definition of a student-athlete. We think it should be again.

The new rules may prove to be a boon for schools like the College of Southern Idaho, which don't have to deal with NCAA standards for incoming freshmen. The challenge for junior colleges is going to be assuring that they maintain meaningful academic standards and not dummy-down their curriculum to attract talented jocks who can't cut it in the classroom at State U.

CSI men's basketball coach Fred Trenkle is fond of pointing out that all but a handful of his athletes have left the school with a degree.

More of his counterparts at four-year schools will be able to make that claim five years from now. We hope Trenkle can still do the same.

## Care that's there for you — unless you want to use it

Almost every day since Harris Wofford used the health-care issue to win an upset Senate race, headlines have breathlessly portrayed broad reform of the current system as just around the corner.

Cooler heads say this will not happen soon because polls show most middle-class voters remain satisfied with the care they receive from their employment-based group health insurance.

Some companies, however, are taking a radical step to rein in skyrocketing health costs. If the move is held — and two federal appeals courts recently gave employers a green light — it may not be long before voter satisfaction turns to the outrage necessary for fundamental change.

The idea is to remove from coverage certain workers who are expected to run up the highest medical bills. In recent cases involved cutting benefits for a particularly expensive disease as soon as one employee contracted it and dismissing a worker with heavy health-care expenses related to her family coverage.

The cost-control efforts businesses have been using — such as a large chain's plans to increase employee co-payments and deductibles — provided short-term savings but aren't designed to control the rising cost of care itself. The latest, more extreme practices by employers can be seen as a predictable response to this failure.

They also can be expected to strike an angry chord among workers, polls show their major health-care worry is that somehow their insurance won't protect them if they develop catastrophic illness.

Consider the case of Thelma Fleming, a 35-year-old nurse with a Tennessee nursing home that is paying the cost of her care prematurely to a daughter who suffered from a build-up of brain fluid resulting from developmental abnormalities. The infant had to be kept in the hospital for the first three months of her life, at a cost of \$80,000.

Ms. Fleming wanted to leave her job at the nursing home to take a similar job at another run by the same chain closer to her residence. She was told to report to her new post on a particular day. But when she showed up, she was told the chain no longer needed her services.

Ms. Fleming brought a pregnancy discrimination suit against her employer, which admitted its decision was based on

high insurance costs associated with the illness of her child after birth. The U.S. Court of Appeals in Cincinnati recently denied the claim, saying bias based on medical conditions of newborn children isn't covered by sex-discrimination law.

"Unlike pregnancy and its attendant medical conditions, dependent medical expenses are not gender-specific," the court said.

The case is expected to be appealed to the Supreme Court if the appeals panel refuses to rehear it. Helen Norton, an attorney with the Women's Legal Defense Fund in Washington, said that the case spotlights the major problem with the current health-care system. "People don't want to leave their jobs for fear of losing their health coverage, so employers are beginning to lop off employees based on perceived costs attributed to them," she said.

Nowhere is evidence of this trend more usually sweeping ruling three days after the Fleming case was decided, the U.S. Court of Appeals in New Orleans ruled employers may change their self-insured group health plans to save money after leaping an employee has a particular illness.

Believed to be the highest-level decision to address the issue, the ruling was that a company's decision to cap AIDS benefits for employees is not prohibited by the federal pension and welfare-benefits law, which supersedes state laws with respect to self-insured plans. A majority of all employers has moved to self-insure, rather than continue to contract with a private company, to gain immunity from tough state employment and health-insurance laws.

This ruling is also expected to be appealed to the Supreme Court.

The ultimate result of businesses continuing to shun employees with the largest health claims may be that the reason people want insurance is undermined.

As more companies become desperate for solutions to extricate themselves from the health-cost squeeze, this argument is likely to find resonance with an increasingly anxious public.

## Mr. President: Please stay healthy

WASHINGTON — The televised images from Tokyo of an ashen-faced, inert George Bush, looking comatose as a KO'd prize fighter or a swimmer hauled from the surf, were the most frightening pictures of the Bush presidency.

Reporters on the scene noted that Bush's physician, Dr. Burton Lee, was "laughing" as he revived the groggy president.

I can't account for Lee's peculiar attack of merriment. But I doubt if other Americans gaping at their supine president shared the doc's strange hilarity.

For many, perhaps, the sight of Bush seemingly down for the 10-count sent two words flashing across their minds like a neon sign:

"President Quayle?!"

Go ahead, call it more Quayle-bashing by the media. But every poll shows words in the English language, ranking somewhere behind "HIV epidemic," "world-wide depression" and "nuclear alert."

Happily, the sudden flu attack only resulted, as Bush quipped later, "in a big cleaning bill." But the Big Tokyo Faint was no joke. It put an untimely focus at the beginning of the 1992 campaign on Bush's frantic traveling schedule, his health, and especially on the man — in that ageless phrase — who's a Heartbeat Away from the Presidency.

Let's get one thing clear: Bush is not going to dump Quayle from the '92 ticket. Ever. No way. Sure, Quayle's poll numbers are horrendous. Blame it on his wretched '88 campaign. Blame it on his gaffes ("What a waste it is to lose one's mind, or not to have a mind is very wasteful,") Blame it on late-night comics. Blame it on his "deer-frozen-in-headlights" TV gaze.

Despite a three-year hustle by Bush and a high-powered P.R. apparatus, Quayle hasn't budged the public perception: Not Ready for the Oval Office.

Quayle was greeted in New Hampshire by a dismal poll in the Manchester Union-Leader, a newspaper to the right of Attila the Hun — 77 percent would prefer another vice president.

And those are Republicans. A recent Gallup poll shows 54 percent of Americans think Quayle "unqualified" to be president, a jump from 40 percent when Bush mysteriously picked him.

That's why Bush's Upchuck-Heart-Round-the-World started a flap up of Washington punditry: If the 1992 election looks perilously close, wouldn't Bush be tempted to ditch his Boy Veep?

And turn the Republican right wing into an overturned hornets' nest.

Bush's health glitches (glaucoma, heart fibrillations, thyroid problem) aren't uncommon for a 67-year-old man, even one who flails his body in bouts of jogging, tennis, golf and horsetoes.

But consider Bush's madcap schedule, one that would drain a 21-year-old Olympic marathoner: A 19,000-mile trip, with 18-hour days, from Singapore's heat to Korea's

cold. Back to Washington for a round of appearances. Then a Monday trip on Kansas City. On to New Hampshire Wednesday to hit the political truck stops.

Anyone rattled by the specter of a President Quayle replacing an ailing Bush may not be reassured by a seven-part series running in the Washington Post. The opus might be entitled, "The Life and Times of a Rich, Lucky Kid," a mystifying six-month effort by the newspaper that broke Watergate.

For political mavens, the oddest quotes are stinging shots by Dan and Marilyn Quayle at Jim Baker. The Quayles blame Baker, Bush's best pal, for "incidents that caused them trouble." Quayle's eye is obviously on the 1996 nomination, with Baker as his No. 1 adversary.

But the Post's thrust is that Dan is no lightweight duncer, this reader was unconvinced. I sympathize with Quayle's golf obsession. But when a man needs a Marine helicopter, a squad of Secret Service agents and a teaching prop for six hours of golf on Long Island, N.Y. — filmed by a video camera — he needs an addiction counselor.

Same veep who could only spare Vaclav Havel, Czechoslovakia's hero, 20 minutes.

That's why Tokyo TV footage of Bush going lights-out was a momentary spine tingler.

Please, Mr. President, take care. Slow down, get your Z's, eat your chicken soup.

Keep Dan Quayle, your blue-eyed, photogenic No. 2, where the nation finds him most comfortable. On the first tee at Burning Tree.

**Buhl board didn't play fair**

Have you ever tried to play a fair game when the rules keep changing?

This is the situation that Buhl teachers faced as they tried to reach a contract settlement.

Rule change No. 1: The board wanted a balanced budget. The fact-finders gave them a balanced budget. Then, they changed their request to a balanced budget plus 5 percent cushion (now reduced to 3.5 percent).

Rule change No. 2: At the beginning of negotiations over one-half year ago, all of the proposals were accepted as negotiable. The board then changed the rules — after mediation — and chose not to negotiate selected items. Teachers were first made aware of this rate change through a letter to the editor.

Rule change No. 3: Last year in the dispute in negotiations, the teachers were criticized for not going to fact-finding. This year, the teachers agreed to fact-finding as requested by the board. Now the board chooses not to honor it anyway. Which rule do we follow now?

Based on the above rule changes, many half truths have clouded the issues:

- The purpose of fact-finding was to reach a balance between two groups. The fact-finding report is not the teachers' demands but an affordable compromise. Useless, not cloud this issue with a bunch of lies.
- The board states that as teachers obtain additional college credits, the salary schedule pays them more money. That simply is not true! Approximately one-fourth of our teachers are frozen on the salary schedule — no extra money for college credits.
- The board also points out that the district provides a lot of opportunities for teachers to visit other classes and to attend workshops. Ask what happened to

professional leave after contract settlement last year. Ask where the 76.5 professional leave days were used this year.

- In the recent letter mailed out by the school board to selected people, it states, "The Buhl Education Association negotiators objected to the inclusion of the provision for any district cash reserve." The teachers have never taken that position. The teachers have only asked for fact-finding to be accepted, which does allow the school district a cash reserve.
- The facts have been turned in. Our school board refused to accept them. Our options were to strike or accept the board's final proposal. We chose to accept under protest. What else could we have done?

# Government: Prices paid by wholesalers fell in 1991 for 1st time in 5 years

WASHINGTON — Prices paid by wholesalers fell in 1991 for the first time in five years; the government

said Thursday in a report reflecting a dramatic swing in oil costs and a stagnant economy.  
In another sign of sluggishness, the Labor Department said separately that

new claims for unemployment insurance jumped in the last full week of the year, even though Christmas left laid-off workers one less day than usual to file for benefits.

The department's Producer Price Index declined a seasonally adjusted 0.2 percent in December, bringing wholesale inflation for the year to minus 0.1 percent.

That followed a 5.7 percent rise in 1990 as the performance of the index was 2.3 percent down in 1986. Declines in the index are rare. There have been only five since 1955. The

1986 drop was the first since 1963. "Low inflation is one of the few bright spots we have," said economist Sandra Shaber of The Futures Group, a Washington consulting firm.

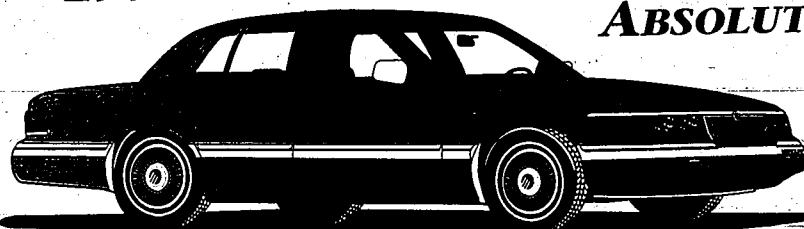

## Surgeons stop silicone breast implants

TWIN FALLS - Two Magic Valley plastic surgeons have stopped giving women breast implants made of silicone gel, but say no conclusive evidence exists that the devices are harmful.

Ketchum plastic surgeon Craig Bass and Twin Falls plastic surgeon David Becker said they have been besieged with calls from concerned women they have

performed the operations on since August when the Food and Drug Administration announced it would study reports about possible dangers from the implants.

The FDA asked surgeons on Monday to quit giving women breast implants made of silicone gel because it cannot assure the safety of the devices.

The action will stop the use of breast implants until the FDA and an advisory panel, to be convened within the next six weeks, can assess the latest data. The

action was based, in part, on new reports regarding ruptures and "anecdotal" evidence that recipients may be at greater risk of immunity system disorders.

According to the FDA, 2 million women have received silicone gel breast implants, and more than 10,000 receive implants monthly. About 80 percent are for cosmetic purposes, with the rest used to reconstruct breasts removed as the result of disease or injury.

Becker suspended all breast implant

operations in August, and Bass stopped giving the operation on Monday. However, since the material does not affect saline-filled breast implants, Becker said he started offering the operation on Monday.

Bass, who has performed thousands of silicone gel implants on women from across the nation over the past 20 years, said no scientific evidence exists that the implants cause immune disorders. If

## Financial experts see bright light continuing in Gem State's future

TWIN FALLS - Idaho's economy shouldn't be hurt too much by the national economy this year, bank officials said Thursday.

Economist Kelly Matthews of First Security Bank said the Gem State's economy should continue to be among the nation's strongest. Matthews spoke to about 300 business people at its annual business outlook symposium.

First Security once again predicted a poor but improving national economy, but that slight upswing could help Idaho.

"Improved optimism regarding the national economy may strengthen Idaho consumers' confidence and spending," Matthews said.

"In addition, Idaho's labor-force advantages will continue to draw jobs to the state."

Matthews predictions for Idaho's economy include:

- Total personal income will increase 6 percent, compared with 5.7 percent last year. Hourly wages will go up about 3.5

- percent. Non-agricultural employment will increase 2.5 percent, slightly lower than in years past.
- Total construction will drop 3 percent, but home building will increase 5 percent. Home building increased 13.5 percent in 1991.
- Crop prices will be a mixed bag. Beef prices likely will drop, but a small crop and a starving Russia could keep wheat prices up. Early contracting for potatoes is at about the same price as in 1991.
- Consumer spending should increase about 5 percent, a slight rise over spending in 1991. Automobile sales should go up 6 percent after a 20 percent plunge in 1991.

First Security Chief Executive Officer Spencer Eccles said there was a "reasonable probability" that the national recession would end in 1992.

The gross production of the nation should increase slightly this year, Eccles predicted, but the United States will have to grapple with deflation in real estate, commodity prices, retail products and wages. Housing starts will be "meager," but home building in the Intermountain

West should continue to be a "positive growth sector."

Automobile sales will suffer through "a very scary, weak year," Eccles said. All in all, growth will remain sluggish through 1993, Eccles predicted.

"The confidence of individuals and business has eroded seriously," Eccles said. "Ugly economic numbers and a perceived vacuum in political economic leadership have been thrust into the national spotlight."

And he is worried about politics making that worse.

"The very thought that the Senate and House will descend upon Washington, D.C., with the zealous intent of 'fixing' the broken U.S. economy is perhaps the biggest nightmare of all."

A tax cut aimed at the middle class won't spur spending if the middle class is worried about jobs, he said. A more appropriate response, Eccles said, would probably be to cut capital gains taxes or implement an investment tax credit.

That would be more likely to improve corporate profits and stop layoffs, Eccles said.

## How to get in, out of recessions

This is how the U.S. economy has fallen into a recession, according to First Security Bank.

## FBI still investigating Hansen finances; prosecutor says no one has filed charges

IDAHO FALLS - Although federal officials say they still are investigating allegations of wrongdoing against former Idaho Congressman George Hansen, Bonneville County Prosecutor Kimball Mason says he isn't pursuing charges against Hansen because nobody has filed a complaint.

"We got to have somebody come in and complain of a wrongdoing," Mason said.

The FBI said it's investigating allegations that Hansen, Idaho's 2nd District congressman for seven terms ending in 1984, and business associate John Scoresby ran a multimillion dollar check fraud scheme.

"We're still pursuing it," said Mike Dillon, senior supervising agent for Idaho. He said it is not unusual for a complex financial investigation to take a year or longer.

No criminal charges have been filed against either man, but Rupert farmer Brad Neibaur pleaded guilty Wednesday to one bad-check charge and agreed to cooperate with the investigation into the alleged check-kiting scheme.

Scoresby, Idaho Falls, is regional chairman for the Idaho Republican Party.

Scoresby and Hansen in February signed a "civil consent" agreement with the state Department of Finance. It acknowledged violations of state securities laws and a debt of \$18 million.

Finance Director Belton Patty filed the civil lawsuit against Hansen and Scoresby in 7th District Court, Idaho Falls. Seventh District Judge Marvin Smith signed a judgment against Hansen and Scoresby and issued a permanent injunction against them.

State and local authorities say they are letting federal investigators take the lead in the multi-jurisdictional case.

"The federal people have taken the bulls by the horns, so to speak," said Bannock County Prosecutor William Bacon.

Bacon said one Bannock County investor came forward several months ago to seek action against Hansen and was referred to federal investigators.

## Accounting ways change in Jerome

JEROME - Jerome City Council members voted to hire an accountant to help keep track of city funds.

The city will advertise for an accountant with an annual salary range of \$23,000 to \$26,000. With benefits, the new position could cost the city as much as \$34,000 per year.

The council convened a special meeting Thursday after several executive sessions to decide the best way to comply with a recent audit of the city that recommended the change.

"Our auditors told us we need to prepare more concise monthly records," Mayor Gerald Ostler said earlier in the day.

He added the accountant was needed to take over some of the duties of current city clerk and treasurer Helen Paoli, who earned more than \$12,000 last year in overtime pay.

"Our auditors told us that was not a good idea," Ostler said.

Paoli said the city clerk's office could use the services of an accountant since she has been burdened by paperwork involved with the many grants the city has received.

Ostler added the city is solvent, even though at a previous meeting, council members discussed a possible cash-flow problem.

"We weren't enough aware of our expenses from October to now," Ostler said.

"Some of our spending we didn't have to make. We'll be more on top of that in the future."

In other business, the council heard a report by Idaho Transportation Department representatives on options for upgrading the traffic flow and safety at the intersection of state Highway 25 and Lincoln Street.

The council took no action, until members receive additional information from the Transportation Department.

## Plant set for Bliss this spring

BLISS - A 1980's project, which will bring new jobs and revenue to this tiny town, will finally get under way in 1992.

Dave Brose of Brose Chemical told the council Wednesday that a new pilot chemical plant will begin construction this spring, four years after the first proposal was brought before the council.

Brose said the small chemical plant, a sister to a larger plant in operation in Twin Falls, will manufacture polymers for food processing, mining and waste treatment, but will eventually grow to include a 10,000- to 20,000-gallon stainless steel chemical mixing reactor.

He expects to have the larger plant built within five years, and he told the council he hopes to train and employ several local people in the larger facility.

His company is "trying to stay on a cash basis," though so initial plans call for a small-mixing site, Brose said.

When the rest of the project is completed, the pilot building will become a research and development building.

The plant will be using ethylene oxide, which Brose said has about the same flammability as propane, to produce the polymers at the Bliss site.

He added his company sells the polymers in different forms to be used as, among other things, sealant inhibitors and as foam suppressants for the sugar beet industry.

Brose is also planning on selling a portion of the property proposed for the plant to Evans Grain for its

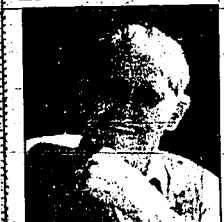

into his job. Williamson said his 60- to 80-hour work week was not amenable to raising a family.

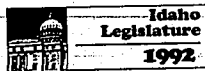

## Valley lawmakers near reapportionment plan

**BOISE** — Magic Valley legislators can't wait until the floor of a redistricting plan for the eight-county area Thursday, but questions about its legality kept them from signing off on it.

Ten House members from southern Idaho met for much of the day in one several regional caucuses. The caucuses were intended to try to resolve the redistricting issue, which threatens to bog down the 1992 Legislature.

Also Thursday, a Senate committee approved and sent to the floor a plan to redraw Idaho's two congressional districts, and a resolution setting a Jan. 31 deadline for finishing redistricting.

And one legislator prepared to introduce a bill to turn the issue over to a citizens' commission. There appeared to be broad bipartisan support in the Magic Valley House delegation for one plan, a version of the first plan adopted by the special redistricting committee last fall.

But a report released late Thursday cast doubt on whether that plan, in its original form, could withstand a court challenge.

The report, by former state Senator Ray Rigby and former District Judge J. Ray Durtschi, said the plan splits too many counties and has too high a population deviation between districts. Another plan, devised by Democrats on the panel, also had too high a deviation, they said.

But Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, said the proposal being considered by the Magic Valley caucus might still work, depending on how many counties were split in the rest of the state.

The breakthrough in the Magic Valley came when Rep. Leanna Lasuen, D-Mountain Home, agreed to give some Elmore County precincts to the Magic Valley.

The 650 people in those precincts — King Hill and the rural precincts to the north — are enough to give the valley enough population for five full districts, thereby maintaining its proportionate strength in a 35-district Legislature.

Lasuen had opposed giving up any Elmore precincts during the special redistricting committee's deliberations last year.

But she said Thursday she would rather give up the rural precincts than Glenns Ferry, which several proposed plans have grouped with the Magic Valley.

The Bills and Redskins figured to be in the games, while the Broncos and the Lions are the surprises. That explains why the Bills are favored by 11 1/2 points and the Redskins by 13 1/2 points.

Even the Vegas oddsmakers have made it prohibitive to even think of anything else — they're laying 3-5 that the Super Bowl will be Bills vs. Redskins. If you think it will be the Broncos vs. Lions, you've got a bargain at 22-1.

In any case ... Denver (plus 11) at Buffalo  
At least the Broncos are used to the weather — there was 18 inches of snow in Denver this week, which is 18 inches more than Buffalo expects. However, the game is at Rockin' Rich Stadium.

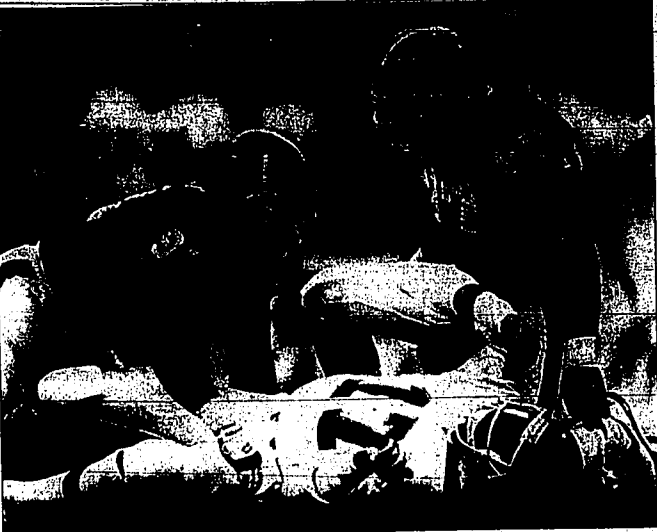
Let's go back to last year, when the Broncos led the Bills 21-9 in the fourth quarter and were lining up for a short field goal that would make it 24-9. The kick was blocked... Cornelius Bennett returned it 80 yards for a touchdown, and 77 seconds later, the Bills led 29-21.

There's one major mismatch in this game, the Bills receive — Andre Reed, James Lofton and Don Beebe, not to mention Keith McKeel and Thurman Thomas — against Denver cornerbacks Wynon Henderson, Tyrone Braxton and Charles Dimry.

Yes, the deficiencies of the Denver corners are mitigated somewhat by Denver's zone — playing man-to-man, Dimry was burned by Jerry Rice for five touchdowns last year in Atlanta.

"It's a tremendous honor," said Sanders, speaking by telephone from Detroit, where the Lions are getting ready to play at the Washington Redskins in the National

Conference championship Sunday.

"I have kind of mixed emotions because I'm involved in preparing for a big game and I can't give much attention to the award as I should," he said.

Fontes, also speaking by telephone from Detroit, said his success was due to the "never-say-die" attitude of his coaching staff and players.

"I got a tremendous job," he said. "To do what they have through all the injuries is a great thing." Fontes coached the Lions to a 12-4 regular season record despite losing five starters at a public news rally the night before the game in Orlando, Fla.

NEW YORK (AP) — A spectre hung over Yankee Stadium on Thursday, like the dark gray clouds sending a cold winter rain down on the Bronx.

Inside, fish was among the dishes being served, and something definitely was very fishy. After months and months of inactivity, money suddenly was spurting to free agents as if George Steinbrenner was back.

Clearly, he wasn't physically present for the official unveiling of Danny Tartabull (\$25.5 million) and Mike Gallego (\$5.1 million), the newest pieces in the New York Yankees' faded collection. But the gloss of Steinbrenner was nonetheless clear.

Why was Steinbrenner's 23-year-old son, Hal, suddenly making major decisions? Why was Joseph Molloy, The Boss' son-in-law, also involved? And why did Daniel McCarthy, the new interim managing general partner, immediately decide to open the vault?

"I don't know. I don't know. I'm not going to answer things like that," was all general manager Gene Michael would say.

Once again, the principal owner of the New York Yankees had become more important than

the players on his team. Up ahead is the possibility that the Bronx bully will be hiring and firing and shouting like in days of old.

Is that what Tartabull came to New York for? "I think what basically makes Danny Tartabull tick is pressure," the 29-year-old outfielder said. "I thrive on that."

He and his wife, Kellie, are used to the quiet life of Carmel, Calif., and Kansas City, Mo. Were they concerned that they might be only an 0-for-8 away from the public doghouse of a resurrected Boss?

"No, not really," Kellie Tartabull said. "I think Danny can handle that." Even if he does, and even if he has a season

similar to 1991 — 316 average, 31 homers; 100 RBIs — he still won't solve the Yankees' biggest problem: pitching.

"We need pitching," Michael said. "If we get pitching back, we can be a contender."  
Last Jan. 22, in the same Stadium Club in the bowels of the ballpark, Michael introduced Scott Sanderson, Steve Fair, Mike Witt and Tim Lincecum.

"I feel that we don't have any of it" on our pitching staff," the general manager said back then.

Obviously, 162 games and a 71-91 fifth-place finish changed his mind. For months, everyone had waited for the team to make changes, but it was only last Wednesday that Michael was given the go-ahead to sign free agents.

"I wanted to make moves," Michael said. "But what could I do until they tell me?"  
And what made "they" change their minds? "I don't know," Michael said. "Ask them."

George Steinbrenner denies playing a part in this latest turnaround. And commissioner Fay Vincent said he doesn't have any evidence that Steinbrenner has violated his banishment agreement. But all the signs are there.

# Lesser-known college seniors look at Hula Bowl as business opportunity

HONOLULU (AP) — For some players, the Hula Bowl is a chance to kick back, enjoy the sun and meet their college all-star peers before heading to the NFL. For others, it's another chance to show they belong in the pros.

Headline players like quarterbacks David Kingler of Houston, Matt Blundin of Virginia, and Indiana running back Vaughn Dunbar are assured of being high-draft picks. Others, like Southern Cal linebacker Kurt Barber, Georgia Tech defensive back Ken Swilling and Kansas running back Tony Sands, say a strong performance in Sunday's game will improve their draft position.

"I feel if I have a really good

game I can move up a couple of notches in the draft," Barber said. "This is another game to showcase my talents. I'm here for business."  
It's not that Barber isn't going to be drafted; he's considered one of the top outside linebackers. But the difference between being a fifth- or sixth-round pick and a second- or third-round choice can mean hundreds of thousands of dollars.

The same is true of Swilling. An All-American as a junior, Swilling was hampered early in the year by injuries and wants to show scouts he's regained his old form.

"This game is very important for me, but probably the most important thing will be how I test at the

scouting combine," Swilling said. "I'm just getting back to playing very well."  
For Sands, it's the same old thing: trying to prove he's big enough at 5-foot-6 to withstand the pounding.

Sands proved his ability at the college level, rushing for an NCAA-record 396 yards in one game last season against Missouri. The 175-pounder led the Big 8 Conference in rushing with 1,429 yards, and is the all-time leading rusher in Kansas

history with 3,788 yards. Still, there are doubters.

"It's nothing new to me, taking on these tasks, not being known when I felt I should be," Sands said. "These next two games are going to be very important to my future. I've got the ability to play with the big boys. I just have to get that point across to other people. It's a fun challenge, especially when people tell you you can't do it."

For a player like Dunbar, a good game can elevate him a few places

higher in the first round, and that again is the difference between big bucks and bigger bucks.

"As a youngster, I never imagined I'd be in this position. To say you're definitely going to be a first-round

pick, and a very high pick, that's great," Dunbar said. "But for some guys that didn't get showcased during the season, this is one extra game to show pro scouts what they can do."

## Gamsakhurdia vows to fight on

### Briefly

#### French Socialist leader touts healing

PARIS — The governing Socialist Party elected Laurent Fabius as its new leader Thursday, and he pledged loyalty to a longtime rival who is now the party's clear choice to succeed President François Mitterrand.

Fabius, a former premier, will step down as National Assembly president to take on the task of healing internal feuds and reviving the Socialist Party's popularity.

"He was elected without dissent by the party's 131-member governing committee."

Eleven members abstained, including the left-leaning former defense minister, Jean-Pierre Chevènement. He complained that policy issues had been ignored during the selection of a new leader.

The outgoing party leader, Pierre Mauroy, 63, announced his resignation plans earlier this week and named Fabius, a favorite of Mitterrand, as his preferred successor.

#### Radical group still opposes Simon tour

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Hours of meetings Thursday between Paul Simon and a radical black group failed to defuse threats of violence at the musician's upcoming concert.

Simon and the president of the tiny Azanian Youth Organization gave differing views of their talks to a crowded news conference two days before the start of Simon's two-week, six-show tour.

The youth organization, a wing of the small black nationalist Azanian People's Organization, has threatened violence to "stop Simon's tour in the Right Track" tour in South Africa.

The tour would be the first by a major American artist since leading black groups endorsed the lifting of cultural sanctions last year.

#### U.S. denies it flew into Libyan airspace

ROME — Libya has accused the U.S. military of violating its airspace, but the Navy fleet in the region denied the charge Thursday.

Libya's civil aviation authorities protested to the International Air Transport Association, accusing the U.S. 6th Fleet of violating the "aerial zone of Tripoli," Libya's official news agency said today.

The agency report, which was monitored in Rome, did not say when the alleged violation occurred or give any other details.

Lt. Greg Smith, spokesman for the 6th Fleet based in Gaeta, Italy, said the only U.S. military craft in the area is the USS America, which is conducting routine flight operations in international airspace in the central Mediterranean.

"No violation of any nation's airspace has occurred," Lt. Smith said. He said the carrier, which is based in Norfolk, Va., has been in the central Mediterranean on routine deployment since early December.

#### Rampaging elephant kills tour guide

HARARE, Zimbabwe — An enraged cow elephant charged a group of foreign tourists and gored their guide to death, a tour company said Thursday.

Richard Trumble, 36, died Sunday shortly after being gored by the elephant's flailing tusks, said a spokeswoman for the Kumana Safari Lodge in Hwange National Park.

None of the three tourists was hurt.

Trumble, a Zambian-born Briton, was an experienced and popular tour guide who worked in western Zimbabwe for several years, the company said.

#### Rock slide kills miners in South Africa

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — Three miners died Thursday when an earthquake set off a rock slide underground, and two men died in another mine when they fell into a shaft, officials said.

The accidents brought to four the number of fatal mine accidents in South Africa in three days. Eleven men have died.

The Anglo American Corp. said four men were also missing following the rock slide at a gold mine near Carletonville, south of Johannesburg.

The victims were more than a mile underground at the mine south of Johannesburg when the quake, which measured 3 on the Richter scale, occurred.

Later Thursday, the Impala Platinum Ltd. mining company said two miners were killed when they became entangled in rope while lowering equipment and fell down a shaft. That accident took place near Rustenburg, 62 miles northwest of Johannesburg.

TBILISI, Georgia — Thousands of mourners kept Thursday at funerals for two men killed at a rally for President Zviad Gamsakhurdia, and the ousted leader was quoted as saying he would continue to fight his opponents.

Gamsakhurdia still enjoys broad support in rural areas of the former Soviet republic, and the Tass news agency said there were signs of growing activity on his behalf in western Georgia.

The president fled to Armenia on Monday after 16 days of fighting in the capital between his supporters and troops of the Georgian National Guard and other opposition groups.

Although Gamsakhurdia overwhelmingly won free elections last May, opponents claimed he had become dictatorial, jailing critics and closing newspapers.

An opposition-formed military council has taken power in Tbilisi.

Tass said volunteers were signing up in western Georgia "to defend the lawfully elected president of the country."

The agency did not quote any sources.

Pro-Gamsakhurdia demonstrations have occurred daily since Jan. 5 in Sukumi, capital of the Abkhazian autonomous region in southwestern Georgia.

### Yelstin says Russia will keep fleet

MOSCOW — Boris Yelstin declared Thursday that Russia will never surrender its Black Sea fleet, and Ukraine's president stepped back from a confrontation by postponing his effort to take over the powerful armada.

Control over the fleet of 45 surface warships and 300 smaller vessels — long the pride of the Soviet navy — is the thorniest issue dividing the two most populous and powerful former Soviet republics.

"The Black Sea fleet was, is and will be Russia's," the Tass news agency quoted Yelstin as telling workers at an aircraft factory during a tour of provincial Russian cities.

Yelstin's comments, his strongest yet on the issue, reflected Russia's attachment to the fleet established by Catherine the Great in 1783.

"Thousands of Russians, many of them sailors, rallied Wednesday to the fleet's home port of Sevastopol against Ukrainian control over the ships."

Forty-four percent of the 1.3 million servicemen based in Ukraine are Russian.

Russia has smaller fleet base operations in the eastern Black Sea, along about 350 miles on its territory, including Novorossiysk and Sochi. Ukraine has about 450 miles of Black Sea coastline.

### Rangers use chainsaws to chop off rhinos' horns, save their lives

HARARE, Zimbabwe — In a desperate attempt to save the rhino, one of Africa's most endangered species, rangers are cutting off the animals' prized horns to make them undesirable to poachers.

"It's not as painful as it sounds, they say."

"Without the horn they're of no value to poachers," explained Dr. Mike Kock, a veterinarian surgeon with the National Parks and Wildlife Department. "And since the horn is actually compressed hairlike fibers, it's like cutting fingernails."

The deborning is a last-ditch bid to protect Zimbabwe's dwindling herds of about 2,000 rhinos in wildlife sanctuaries. The Zimbabwe herds include two-thirds of the world's black rhinos, which are in greater danger of extinction than the white rhinos.

Only 20 years ago, 65,000 black rhinos roamed Africa.

Poachers, often with the help of corrupt officials, have slaughtered tens of thousands of black and white rhinos for horns that are worth about \$12,000 each on the black market.

"The horns are considered an aphrodisiac and used for folk medicine in the Far East and as decorative dagger handles in Yemen."

at least 145 poachers the past seven years, and still have lost at least 960 rhinos to money-hungry poachers.

Despite the risk, the poachers still come, mostly across the Zambezi River from neighboring Zambia in dugout canoes under cover of

darkness. The sale of a few horns can produce a fortune equal to a life's wages for peasants.

Tourists have mixed reactions to seeing the hornless rhinos.

"They're the funniest-looking things," said Sheila Norton, a nurse from Manchester, England. "They don't look like rhinos, or anything for that matter. No one at home will believe my photographs. But if it means they're going to be protected, I'm all for it."

One Zimbabwean wrote the Harare Herald newspaper to disagree. "I think it is terrible to do such a cruel thing. Can you imagine what happens when the animal wakes up to find a piece of its body gone?"

To protect the animals, National Parks Assistant Director Rowan Martin proposed the rhinos be deborned. He was inspired by the success of a similar operation in neighboring Namibia in 1989.

Under a pilot program last year, pooper-planes tracked down about 100 rhinos. Helicopters dropped rangers and vets, who gave the animals sedatives before using the chainsaws.

Dr. Chris Goggins, a veterinarian, monitored the animals' heart and other vital functions during the operations.

"And while the rhinos were losing their majestic appendages, their ears were notched for later identification and to track their progress."

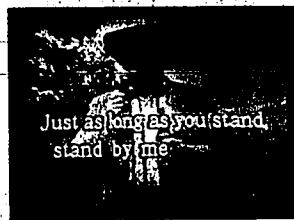

# Karaoke style

**TWIN FALLS** - It may go down as the first time in entertainment history that a singer performed America's "Sister Golden Hair" and Young M.C.'s "Bust A Move" on the same night.

Most evenings, Steve Hudson is a bartender at Diamondfield Jack's lounge in the Best Western Canyon Springs Inn.

But last weekend, Hudson and others traded their anonymous selves for stardom as the intimate lounge played host to its first Karaoke sing-along.

Karaoke (most people pronounce it car-O-key) started in Japan about 20 years ago, explained Steve Hays, who sells and rents Karaoke systems in Idaho and eastern Oregon.

Karaoke caught on in California a few years ago and has since swept inland, with some bars - including Timberlane's in Boise - now specializing in what Hays called "a high-tech portable piano bar."

"It's a very economical way to attract and hold a crowd," Hays said.

"The people here are their own entertainment."

"There's a little bit of ham in all of us."

The word Karaoke means "empty orchestra," just as karate means "empty handed," Hays said.

The DK Karaoke system, which Hays represents, features a library of hundreds of pre-recorded instrumental tracks aren't the exact performances made famous by the original artists; but they're close enough.

And the selections are wide-ranging. "You've Lost That Loving Feeling" and "Great Balls of Fire" are frequent favorites, Hays said, but singers could also pick "Blame it on the Bossa Nova" by Eydie Gorné, "God Bless America" or, as Lynn Hudson did last Friday, the giddy "Ballroom Blitz," made famous in 1973 by Sweet.

"That's one of my old favorites," Hudson said afterward. "I haven't heard it in 10 years."

Several Spanish songs are available, as are standards such as "Home on the

Range" and "Amazing Grace." Singers could even choose to lip-synch their way through Milli Vanilli's "Girl I'm Gonna Miss You."

Some of those singing at Diamondfield Jack's had prior performing experience. Sylvia Dill, who often sings at the lounge, turned in a rich, heartfelt rendition of "The Night They Drove Old Dixie Down."

Mike Copenberger, who won the local KEZI-True Value Hardware Country Showdowns in 1989 and 1990, was in fine voice for "Today I Started Loving You Again" and "Big City" by Merle Haggard. Later, he joined David Gossell in a duet of "To All the Girls I've Loved Before."

And Pauline Collins and Pam Hansen, Irish-born twin sisters who sometimes perform together at weddings, also took the microphones several times, much to the audience's delight.

But others were performing alone in front of people for the first time. Hudson last sang in junior high school choir, "but that was before my voice changed," he recalled.

"I was nervous about it at first," Hudson said of his performance of "Sister Golden Hair."

"But once it got going, it's kind of fun," he added. Soon, in fact, he was back on stage to rap through "Bust A Move." The fast-paced lyrics occasionally got away from him, but Hudson persisted as the audience clapped along and hoed support.

Rob Rashon is known to sing in the shower, his wife, Heather, confided. But he was persuaded to sing a soulless rendition of "Honky Tonk Man," the Johnny Horton classic later covered by Dwight Yoakam.

Nervous singers can take comfort in the fact the Karaoke system offers reverber and echo, the same "too much" producers use to make less-than-perfect performers sound great.

And if a singer finds the song's key is too low or too high, it can instantly be changed to fit the performer's range.

Karaoke's appeal stems from the fact just about everyone has "always wanted to be a rock 'n' roll star," said Sonny Knutson, who assists Hays.

But Hays said Karaoke fans span the ages. "I've brought it to five different retirement homes in Boise," he noted. "I've never gone to a place where they didn't sing and have fun."

given a lyric sheet to follow instead of a video monitor.

There's no cost to sing, but performers can take home a cassette tape of two songs for \$6, Wray added.

The Weston Plaza, 1350 Blue Lakes Blvd. N., is another area venue that has tried the Karaoke craze.

"We had it last summer, and we had a packed house," lounge manager Karen Miles recalled. "A lot of people thought it was a drink, and they didn't know how to pronounce it."

Miles said 83 people sang the night Karaoke came to Weston Plaza, but she added that that management has no plans to invest in a permanent system.

# Top nominations go to R.E.M., Adams

NEW YORK (AP) — R.E.M. and Bryan Adams, whose hits have sold millions but never won a Grammy, received the most nominations for that award Wednesday, and Natalie Cole collected four for a sentimental tribute to her late father.

Bonnie Raitt was nominated five times, two years after she won four Grammys, and Amy Grant — already a five-time winner for Christian music — ratified her conversion to pop with four nominations for her album, "Heart in Motion."

R.E.M., which had never even been nominated despite 10 albums, topped the list of nominees with seven. Adams, who had been up for two prizes in the past, had six.

Nominees for record of the year were Grant's "Baby Baby," Adams' "I Do It For You," R.E.M.'s "Losing My Religion," Raitt's "Something to Talk About" and Cole's "Unforgettable."

Song of the year nominees were "Baby Baby," "I Do It For You," "Losing My Religion," "Walking in Memphis" sung by Marc Cohn, and "Unforgettable," a single once recorded by her father. Nat King Cole died of lung cancer 25 years ago, when Natalie was 15.

Album of the year nominees were Grant for "Heart in Motion," Raitt for "Luck of the Draw,"

R.E.M. for "Out of Time," Paul Simon for "The Rhythm of the Saints" and Cole for "Unforgettable."

Nominees in the 34th annual Grammy Awards to honor the year's best recording artists were released at the Apollo Theater in Harlem. Winners will be announced Feb. 25 at Radio City Music Hall and televised by CBS.

Barbra Streisand and Cole were nominated for best traditional pop performance. Streisand for the song "Warm and Tender" and Cole for "Unforgettable," which combines Cole's voice with recordings of her father's to create a duet. It was one of 22 songs recorded for the album of the same title. On the single, thanks to overdubbing, father and daughter sing a duet across the bridge of the accompaniment. Other nominations include:

— Adams, Cohn, George Michael, Michael Bolton, Seal and Aaron Neville were nominated for best male pop vocal. Adams was nominated for "I Do It For You," the theme song from the movie "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves."  
— Seal was nominated for the single "Crazy." Michael for "Freedom 90." Cohn for "Walking in Memphis." Neville for his album "Warm Your Heart" and Bolton for his single "When a Man Loves a Woman."

In the category for best female pop vocal, the nominees were Whitney Houston for her single "All the Man I Need," Grant for "Baby Baby," Mariah Carey for her album "Emotions," Raitt for her single "Something to Talk About," and Oleta Adams for "Get Here."

# Once again, Grammys seem out of time

HOLLYWOOD — The key nominees in this year's Grammy competition are, for the most part, thoroughly respectable, but in no way unimpeachable.

The chief disappointment: Few of the nominees for best album and best single record reflect the chief currents of pop in 1991 — a year in which hard-rock staged a major creative comeback, rap continued to explore inner-city tensions and counter-culture's biggest intruders on the pop market in decades.

That means no nominations in the two categories for Guns 'N' Roses, Metallica, Nirvana, Public Enemy or Garth Brooks — all of whom enjoyed more critical attention during the year than most of the actual nominees.

In turning to Paul Simon, Bonnie Raitt, Natalie Cole and Amy Grant in the best album competition, the 7,000 members of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences decided to straddle once again that they are most comfortable with the pop mainstream and old favorites.

Simon, nominated this time for his zesty "The Rhythm of the Saints" album, has won 12 Grammys, including three in the coveted best album category: "Graceland" in 1986, "Still Crazy After All These Years" in 1975 and Simon & Garfunkel's "Bridge Over Troubled Water" in 1970.

Raitt, nominated for "Luck of the Draw," won best album in 1989 for her reflective "Nick of Time." Cole, nominated for "Unforgettable," has won three Grammys, including best new artist in 1975. Grant has five previous Grammys, all in the gospel field.

The only best album nominee who hasn't won previously, however, is the entry that deserves to win in a

close contest against Simon: R.E.M.

The Georgia-based quartet, which blends enigmatic, folk-flavored rockers music with teasingly elusive lyrics, was the class of the alternative and college rock scene in the '80s. It made its own mainstream move in 1988, with "Green," a somewhat fluffily disappointing collection. Last year's "Out of Time," however, was a taut and personal album. Its highlight was "Losing My Religion," a masterful expression of anxiety and self-doubt.

"Losing My Religion" is also the choice here in the best record category, rivaled only by Cole's moving duet with her late father Nat-King Cole's original recording on "Unforgettable." In a year that provided such affecting singles as Sting's "All This Loving" and Public Enemy's "Can't Truss It" and Nirvana's "Smells Like Teen Spirit," the other nominees in this category were especially discouraging.

At least the academy members, who have tended over the years to make

choices more in keeping with the commercial pulse of pop than with the creative, avoided this year such potential embarrassments in the best album category as Michael Bolton, Mariah Carey, Whitney-Houston and Hammer.

Among the especially savvy nominations: Oleta Adams (female pop vocal), Seal (best new artist), Nirvana's "Nevermind" (alternative music album), Public Enemy's "Apocalypse 91..." (rap performance by a duo or group), Travis Tritt's "Here's a Quarter" (country song), John Pineda's "The Missing Years" (contemporary folk album), Sinead O'Connor's "Year of the Horse" and Peter Gabriel's "P.O.V." (both long-form music video).

Major disappointments: Guns 'N' Roses wasn't nominated in the best album or best rock performance categories for either its "Use Your Illusion I" or "Use Your Illusion II" albums, and only "11" was nominated in the best hard-rock performance field. No nomination for Sting in the best album category for "The Soul Cages."

Ice-T was nominated in the solo rap performance and not Ice Cube.

And finally: If you're wondering why Nirvana, whose major-label debut was one of the year's biggest-selling and most acclaimed albums, wasn't nominated for best new artist, here's the answer: The trio wasn't eligible because it had earlier released an album on the independent Sub Pop label.

With the growth of independent labels in recent years, the academy should reconsider its eligibility rules in the category because a lot of exceptional rock artists are going to be declared ineligible for the same technicality in coming years. Better yet: Drop the category altogether. No one seems clear whether it is supposed to honor the new act that made the best debut record or the new act that showed the most potential.

Sadly, most of the past winners in the category — from A Taste of Honey to Christopher Cross — did neither.

# 'Days' worth watching says daytime analyst

Hoping the soaps will clean up in prime-time as last year's Daytime Emmy Awards did, NBC Soap Opera Digest Awards live for the first time tonight.

The awards show, hosted by George Hamilton (late of "Dynasty") and Emma Samms (ex-"General Hospital"), features winners voted by the readers of Soap Opera Digest magazine.

These winners differ considerably from the Daytime Emmys, which are voted by an actor's peers.

Example: "Days of Our Lives" did not win a single major Emmy at last year's ceremony, yet it is nominated in five big Digest categories, including Outstanding Daytime Show, which it won last year. Despite the lack of critical acclaim, "Days" has rabidly loyal fans who apparently vote in droves at Digest Awards time — a tribute to the show's emphasis on romance, and its invention of the super couple: Handsome man meets beautiful woman, one of whom usually suffers from a debilitating disease or is marked for death by the show's resident villain. The super couple fights the disease and/or villain and reunites, with beautiful gettinge-back-together music and exotic location shoots. This formula has inspired unusual fan loyalty for "Days" at award time.

Three films, all about powerful women, top this week's list of new movies on video. One is a semi-surrealistic tale set in Germany, another a controversial adventure about a pair of rebellious women, and the third a tense tale of life during wartime.

**THE NASTY GIRL** 3/4 stars. (1990) (HBO) \$89.99, 94 minutes. Lena Stolze, Hans-Reinhard Muller. A captivating mix of historical fact and surrealist fiction, "The Nasty Girl" is an inspired political satire based on the real-life tragicomic of Anja Rosmus, modern folk-heroin of Passau and exposer of the Bavarian village's Nazi past. Writer-director Michael Verhoeven fancifully embroiders Rosmus' story, situating it in the mythical town of Pilzing to suggest its applicability to all Germany. And it is Verhoeven's good fortune to have cast the irrepressible Stolze (daughter of tenor Gerhard Stolze) as Sonja, a girl who always looks as if she's swallowed a good joke. PG-13 (mature themes, stylized violence, brief nudity).

**THELMA & LOUISE** 3/4 stars. (1991) (MG/MUA) \$94.99, 127 minutes. Geena Davis, Susan Sarandon, Chris McDonald, Harvey Keitel. This unexpected delight is blessed with two high-octane performances. As Thelma, Davis—for the first time since "The Fly" gives a performance that is more than a collection of enduring stammers and unendurable ties. She plays Thelma as a chirpy void who evolves into a woman of action. Sarandon's Louise is the actress' most fully formed character since her role in "Atlantic City," a control freak who lets "er rip for the first time. R (sex, violence, sexual violence, profanity).

**AY, CARMELA!** 3 stars. (1991) (HBO) \$89.99, 105 minutes. Carmen Maura, Andres Bello. It might not rank with Ernst Lubitsch's "The Big Game" or two film masterpieces about actors and their chameleon politics during wartime. But "Ay, Carmela!" is the most politically provocative of the three — if also the most dramatically thin. Despite that, it does convey the despair of someone's being hungry enough to change her political stripes and also shows the fortitude of

R. **DO OR DIE** (1991) (Columbia TriStar) \$79.95, 97 minutes. Pat Morita, Donna Speir, Roberta Vasquez. Action: A pair of beautiful federal agents face off against a ruthless international crime boss. R. **DYING YOUNG** 2 stars. (1991) (Fox) 111 minutes. Julia Roberts, Campbell Scott, David Selby, Colleen Dewhurst. Continuing in the Pity Woman tradition is "Dying Young," a weeper conceived as a "Love Story" for the 90s — (rich boy meets (poor) girl, boy gets terminal illness — "Dying Young" pushes all the buttons. Despite Roberts' 100-percent-cotton performance, nubny and fresh as oxford-cloth, every emotion in "Dying Young" feels synthetic. It's a plastic union that its filmmakers hope will produce tears. R (profanity, sex). (This video supplier does not suggest retail prices on titles it deems primarily for rental.)

**BILL AND TED'S BOGUS JOURNEY** 2 1/2 stars. (1991) (Orion) \$92.99, 98 minutes. Keanu Reeves, Alex Winter, George Carlin, William Sandler. In this supremely silly sequel, Bill and Ted (Winter and the exquisite Reeves) go to hell. Which is heavenly fun. But once Bill and Ted get out of hell, their film loses it — in more ways than one. PG (cartoon violence, lewdness, images of hell).

**BLACK RAINBOW** (1991) (Media) \$89.99, 103 minutes. Rosanna Arquette, Jason Roberts.

strong story line, based on the classic fairy tale, with an exceptionally alive score by lyricist Howard Ashman and composer Alan Menken. Though the beast is a splendid creation, and Belle is a model of self-reliance, the film is just about spoiled by the fatuous, square-jawed presence of Gaston, the most comically conceived of swains. **CAPE FEAR** (R). This is a film as sadistic as its star player. What venomous psychopath Max Cady (played as only Robert De Niro can) does to the lawyer, (Nick Nolte) he has a grudge against exactly parallels what director Martin Scorsese does to his audience. # 'Hook' has hard time getting off the ground

HOLLYWOOD — Though you wouldn't suspect it from his place as the push of popularity, Steven Spielberg's soul is in conflict. Yes, he delights in the bravura mechanics of show business, in pumped-up production design and sets that cost the Earth, but he also wants to create the purest enchantment, to conjure up those charmed moments that make a movie unforgettable.

Few directors can do either thing well, and the problem for Spielberg, who is capable of both, is that they tend to get in each other's way. Worse than that, arrogant spectacle so smooths-ers-gone-magic that it tends to be easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a \$60 million movie to get usable. In "Hook," the outcome of that particular struggle is in doubt until the end, and while enchantment just manages to hold its own, it is not a slight take.

Though this is his 11th feature as director, "Hook" is clearly a project Spielberg has been pointed toward for his entire career. Though nominally a sequel to J.M. Barrie's "Peter Pan," "Hook" is really a modern reworking of that 1904 play, whose subtitle, "The Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up," has often been applied to the director himself. "I've always been Peter Pan," Spielberg told Premiere magazine. "That's why I wanted to do this movie."

"Hook" is a script, which has a rather ponderous credit line (by Jim V. Hart and Malia Scotch Marmo from a story by Hart and Nick Castle based on the works of Barrie), revolves around a quite adult and appealing premise, about one that chooses to reveal itself with what almost might be called reluctance. "Hook" brightly opens—at a school version of the Barrie play, with young Maggie (Amber Scott) playing Wendy, the girl who befriends Peter and goes with him to Neverland. In the audience are Maggie's family, including her portable-home-adapted father, Peter (Robin Williams), and her brother, Jack

(Charlie Kozmo, the tchin from "Dick Tracy"), who is worried, justifiably, it turns out, that his dad will miss his big baseball game the next day.

Peter, it seems, is a corporate raider of the first water, a mergers-and-acquisitions type (nise your hand if this sounds familiar) thinks his business is more important than his family. Still, he and his swell wife, Moira (Caroline Goodall), do find time to take the whole family to London where Gran Wendy (Maggie Smith), Moira's grandmother and supposedly the little girl who told J.M. Barrie those Peter Pan stories in the first place, is going to be honored by an orphanage. Peter was once an orphan himself, it seems, until Gran Wendy (nise your hand if this sounds familiar) adopted him.

When the adults return from the orphanage banquet, however, they are in for a horrible shock: Both Maggie and Jack are gone and an ornate ransom note claims that the Captain Hook is the responsible party. The police naturally view this as some kind of regrettable prank, but Gran Wendy solemnly pulls Peter aside and tells him a truth he is unprepared to hear: His stories were not fiction—but fact and he himself is no ordinary orphan but the real Peter Pan, now grown older. Worse than that, in order to save his children from Captain Hook in Neverland, he must make himself both remember who he was and believe it enough to make it happen again.

Though Peter's adventures in Neverland are clearly what the film is all about, Spielberg almost dawdles in getting us there, spending what feels like forever in setting up the family's not very original emotional conflicts. Yet, even here, magic does peek through, specifically in Smith's glowing performance as Gran Wendy. Expertly aged to a believable 92, Smith has the regal, otherworldly air of the perfect fairy-tale enchantress, and she sets a resonant tone that "Hook" is only—sporadically—able to match.

Once the scene shifts — as it did in the original — to Neverland, the acting gets broader.

**'JFK'** (R). — Disturbing, infuriating, yet undeniably effective and a major piece of filmmaking, Oliver Stone's three-hour-plus look at the assassination of President John F. Kennedy is more manifesto than motion picture. Presenting a wave of evidence arguing against the conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald was the lone killer, "JFK" is never dull but it does talk out of both sides of its mouth, wanting to be accepted not only as dramatically shaped history a la Shakespeare

but also as the unvarnished truth. Even Oliver Stone can't pull that one off.

**THE LAST BOY SCOUT** (R). A violent, sometimes ludicrous bang-zap-zowie crash-a-thon, about two misfit heroes, Bruce Willis and Damon Wayans' disgraced quarterback — who meet, fall in love, woo each other with wisecracks, kill a lot of guys together and then go into business. Writer Shane Black and director Tony Scott know how to work a comedy, but this kind of bloody slunglunty, but the slick shamelessness with which they trowel on the absurdity—is unsettling. It's like watching a TV set gone berserk.

**FATHER OF THE BRIDE** (PG). Set in a prettily lacquered suburban world, this remake of the classic Vincente Minnelli-Spencer Tracy comedy, directed by Charles Shyer, smudges our pleasant memories and replaces them with something smirkier, more complicated and hollow. The earlier film was a gentle, graceful comic nightmare. This one — with Steve Martin and Diane Keaton — seems to adore the maddening wedding conventions as much as it does the family Frank the cat, Martin Short steals the movie.

**BEAUTY AND THE BEAST** (G). Disney's 30th full-length animated feature is the studio's most successful attempt in decades. Managing to be at once wided-up and traditional, it combines a

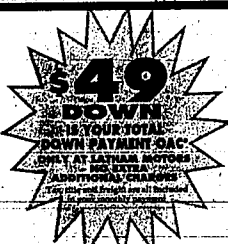

# Family-oriented show finds strength in realistic domestic struggles, joys

"In the last two years, I've gotten a lot of screen time to really show a 'lot of talent,'" says Kellie Shanygne Williams, who plays Laura Winslow on the ABC Friday-night series "Family Matters." "It's been fun, because it gives me a lot of things to do with my character. Every new episode is like a challenge for me. That's what this whole business is about. It's the thrill of knowing you've made it."

Williams plays Laura, the teenage daughter of Carl and Harriette Winslow (played by Reginald VelJohnson and JoMarie Payton), a Chicago couple who share their home with Harriette's sister, Rachel (Telma Hopkins), Rachel's son, Richie (Bryton McClure), and the other two Winslow children, Eddie (Darius McCrary) and Judy (Jaimee Foxworth).

"Our show is real," says Williams. "It's about real people, situations, the money problems we (the characters) have. We've had to sacrifice and really pull things together. It expresses a lot about the family and what we're capable of."

"Family does matter," she adds. "I think it really defines the show, because we deal with a lot of touching issues. It's warm, and it's funny."

Williams' first acting performance came at the age of 6, with a Los Angeles repertory company.

"I remember my first time going into a theater class," Williams says. "And I remember it was fun. The whole atmosphere was so alive and exciting. I enjoyed it so much. I went back every summer afterwards."

"Family Matters" is her first regular series. "It looked so easy before I was on TV," Williams says. "It looked so natural, but you have to rehearse every little thing. So I didn't know how much effort and

time was involved with the whole process. But now I do.

"I think our writers are pretty hip to what's going on, so it makes things easier," she adds. "They don't really come to us on what to write about or how we feel about it, because they pretty well know our characters, how we feel as a person. Not (the character of) Laura, but how Kellie feels and how to write for me. So when you're before an audience and you're with them, you

share what you're doing with them."

But will Laura ever share her heart with the problematic next-door neighbor, Steve Urkel (played by Jaleel White), who carries a torch for her?

"She's pretty harsh with Steve," says Williams.

"But that's how a lot of brothers and sisters and peers are. If you watch a lot of shows, you'll see that. It's a part of the show that is true to family life."

## 'Last Wish' tells of Rollin's final gift to her mother

In autumn 1983, dying of ovarian cancer that chemotherapy could no longer quell, 75-year-old Ida Rollin pleaded with her daughter, Betty, to "help me find a way out" — out of life.

Rollin, a television feature correspondent (at the time for ABC's "Nightline"), struggled with the moral and personal implications of granting her mother's request but managed to find that way, with the help of a physician in Amsterdam who told her what to do.

Their story comes to ABC on Sunday night in "Last Wish," the title Rollin used for the 1985 book in which she detailed her mother's 2½-year-long illness and death. Patty Duke stars as Rollin, Maureen Stapleton as her mother. The broadcast begins at 8 p.m. on KIVI, cable 6.

"To think that you're going to see, on national television, in prime time, a woman kill herself, and you're going to root for it," Rollin reflected last week. "I would never have imagined that."

But then, some would not have imagined that Derek Humphry's "Final Exit," a book that detailed methods of suicide, could remain on the Publishers Weekly best-seller list for 14 weeks last year.

Rollin wrote its preface.

At the same time, Jack Kevorkian, a physician known as "Dr. Death," made news when he helped two women end their lives by using a suicide machine he devised.

So "Last Wish" stands to have a substantial number of viewers. Rollin, who supports legislation to provide for physician-assisted suicide, believes that few doctors will be among the viewers.

Those who do watch will see Ida Rollin's surgeon portrayed as brusque and impersonal, a man she trusted, but whom Betty resented for his lack of empathy.

Rollin, who now works for NBC-TV, said she has seen the movie only once, because it reminds her of her mother, an independent woman who was full of life.

"It's hard for me to watch," she said. "It makes me miss my mother, so I cry right at the beginning, when she's dancing, more than during the sad stuff. It just seems strange that she's not around."

"You never get over it in a way. I miss her during the good times. I miss her now, during this movie. She would have loved it. It seems strange that she isn't here. She would be loving this, and it would be much more fun if she were here."

And, at 40, she and Mexican-American sculptor Robert Graham will soon be husband and wife. It's strictly a matter of the heart rather than a response to Nicholson.

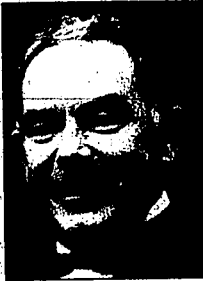

Former "Today" participants have been invited, and Barbara Walters, Bill and Hugh Downs (early "Today" show stars), and now anchors of ABC's "20/20" news magazine have agreed to attend. Also on hand will be former co-host Jane Pauley, Tom Brokaw (who preceded Gumbel as anchor 10 years ago) and John Chancellor. Jerry Seinfeld will be among the entertainers.

The special will be produced by Steve Friedman, executive producer of "Today," from 1980-87.

Not invited: J. Fred Muggs, the lovable chimp who shared the spotlight with the show's original host, Dave Garroway. (Muggs, who lives with his owner in Tampa, Fla., was snubbed during the show's 35th anniversary special as well.)

### ABC rival finishes 1st in year's ratings

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC's "Good Morning America" wrapped up 1991 with its second consecutive year atop the morning talk-show ratings, a network spokeswoman said Monday.

For the week ending Dec. 27, "GMA" earned a 4.0 rating and a 19 share; NBC's "Today" show was second with a 3.3 rating and an 18 share; "CBS This Morning" had a 2.5 rating and a 12 share.

It was the 104th consecutive week in first place for the ABC show, although NBC has tied for first place three times since Labor Day week, said ABC spokeswoman Cathy Rehl.

One rating point equals 921,000 TV households; a share is the percentage of television sets that are tuned to a show in its time period.

For all of 1991, ABC led the morning-talk shows with a 4.2 rating and a 20 share; NBC was second, at a 3.6 rating, 18 share; and CBS trailed with a 2.5 rating, 12 share.

In 1990, ABC had a 4.4 rating, 22 share; NBC 3.4, 16; and CBS 2.4, 12.

## Gumbel signs on for 3 more years

Bryant Gumbel has signed a three-year, multi-million-dollar contract with NBC News to remain with the morning show.

His previous three-year contract had expired.

There had been speculation that Gumbel, 43, who first joined NBC as a sports announcer 16 years ago, would be leaving the network.

Enthusiasm for the "Today" star among network brass has never been quite so high since word of his infamous 1988 "memo" blasting fellow staffers of the morning program surfaced in March 1989. The fallout from those criticisms — many of which were valid and which Gumbel thought he had made in confidence — proved costly to the show and to the public's image of Gumbel. Eventually Jane Pauley, John Palmer and executive producer Marty Ryan moved on. Deborah Norville bombed as Pauley's replacement.

## 'Youngster' begins stint at show's helm

When he takes over as executive producer of NBC's storied "Today" show Jan. 14, the show will be celebrating its 40th birthday.

Which makes "Today," 14 years older than Zucker.

At 26, Jeff Zucker has been entrusted with leading an early morning mainstay — the former TV home of Dave Garroway, Barbara Walters, Brokaw, Jane Pauley and Deborah Norville — into the '90s.

"I know it sometimes takes people a back," he said in a phone interview from New York. "Some people may not think I have enough life experience, and I agree. I have to be open and take advice."

Whatever this slight balding,

bespectacled man lacks in seasoning, he makes up for in savvy. As a "Today" supervising producer since October 1990, he has helped direct the news coverage and assemble the show in the control room. He has shown a flair for covering breaking news and a taste for longer segments that smash TV's sound-bite tendencies.

For the past six months, Zucker has run the show day to day while executive producer Tom Capra handled bureaucratic issues and planning, says Don Browne, executive vice president of NBC News.

"Jeff is one step ahead of everybody else," says Browne, NBC's former Miami bureau chief. "He knows when to move on a story. He knows when to make a show hard

and when to back off."

Browne said Zucker's age is irrelevant. "Vision and creativity are not defined by age," he says. "What put Jeff over the top was the way he handled the Soviet coup in the control room."

Browne said: "Jeff can kick up in high gear in a crisis situation."

Kicking up "Today's" ratings after several tumultuous years has been another plus. Zucker joined the show three years ago, shortly before Gumbel's infamous memo criticizing colleagues turned up in the press. Then the beloved Pauley was displaced as co-anchor by the widely disliked Norville, and "Today's" ratings plunged. In the past year, with Couric taking over for Norville, "Today" has rebounded. In the past three months, it has tied top-rated "Good Morning America" three times.

"We're on a roll," Zucker says. "The tough times are behind us. We know we're on an upswing."

Zucker replaces Capra, who is moving to NBC Productions to make movies, miniseries and reality-based programming.
