House OKs \$1.5 trillion Demo budget

WASHINGTON — The House approved a Democratic budget for 1993 on Thursday that doubles the multibillion-dollar defense cut President Bush wants and shifts most of the money to social and job-creating programs.
The largely party-line 215-201 vote came as White House Chief of Staff Samuel Skinner tried to take the offensive in the administration's other economic battle with Congress — tax-cut legislation.
In an interview, Skinner lashed out at Senate Majority Leader George Mitchell, D-Maine, whom he said would "bring the country suffer than have it recover."
370-42 vote

Mitchell replied that the White House attack was an effort to distract attention from its "inaction on the economy."
In the House's first confrontation this year over the so-called peace dividend, majority Democrats loaded their election-year budget with billions more than Bush would spend for job training, road-building and education programs. Senate Democrats hope to write a similar bill in two weeks.
Democrats want to use their \$1.5 trillion budget to show they, not Bush, are shifting the government's focus toward economic growth and protecting the recession's victims. Lawmakers rejected the president's spending plan on Thursday by

"We do want a productive society, but we also want a society that reaches out with compassion to those who can't make it," said House Budget Committee Chairman Leof Panetta, D-Calif. "There are hungry children in our society.... There are the homeless."
But Republicans complained that by carving about twice the \$44 billion Bush would save from the defense budget over the next five years, Democrats were risking making U.S. defenses too weak.
"I don't want missiles someday coming in at the state of California or any other great state and not have the capability to defend it, because if people are in a coup kitchen or in a mansion, it's not going to

make any difference," said Rep. Kandy "Duke" Cunningham, R-Calif.
Bush proposed ending defense spending next year to \$291.4 billion, \$4.8 billion less than the president planned a year ago. He would use the savings to shrink the budget shortfall.
But Democrats would hold military spending to \$287.2 billion. Of the \$9 billion they would save from Bush's year-old plans, they would spend \$6.6 billion on domestic programs and \$2.6 billion to reduce the deficit.
By a 342-77 vote, the House rejected a proposal by the House's 24 black Democrats for an even deeper \$71 billion

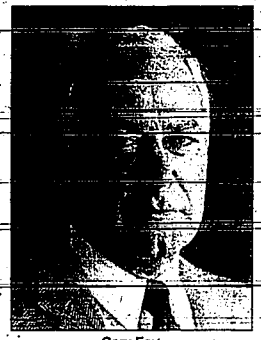

Insurance firm owner agrees to \$15,000 fine

TWIN FALLS — Twin Falls insurance company owner Gary Fay has admitted violating state insurance rules and agreed to pay a \$15,000 fine to the Idaho Department of Insurance.
However, as part of an agreement announced Wednesday, Harry Walrath, director of the Idaho Department of Insurance, has suspended \$10,000 of the fine during a two-year probation.

Fay, a former member of the State Board of Education, will not have to pay the \$10,000 fine if he does not violate any other department rules during the probation, the agreement says.
It says Fay admits violating Idaho insurance laws by operating as an insurance agent without a license on five occasions.
Fay did not have an effective insurance license from Feb. 1, 1990, to Sept. 1, 1991, after he failed to renew his license and did not complete required education classes.
All insurance agents must renew their licenses every two years and attend courses to update their knowledge about the business and about new insurance laws, said Robert Fräundorf, Idaho Department of Insurance licensing director.
While Fay did not have a license he signed a \$23,000 insurance policy for the College of Southern Idaho; college records show.
The college also has letters of correspondence between Fay and CSI dated during the time he did not have a license.
"He agreed that he has crossed the line and agreed to pay the fine," said Kim Day, the

license was not in effect
department's information specialist.
On Thursday, Fay said five licensed insurance agents were conducting the company's business during the time he personally was unlicensed. But Walrath did not agree that operating the business that way was acceptable, Fay said.
"I am licensed now," Fay said.
Fay must pay \$1,000 a month for the next five months to meet the terms of the agreement.

Feds want citizens to finance improved wiretap facilities

WASHINGTON — The Bush administration wants you to pay a little more for telephone service to make it easier for the FBI or local police to listen in on the conversations of suspected criminals.
The Justice Department is circulating a proposal in Congress that would force telephone companies to install state-of-the-art technology to accommodate official wiretaps. And it would authorize the Federal Communications Commission to grant telephone companies rate increases to defray the cost.
A copy of the draft legislation was obtained by The Associated Press.
Attorney General William P. Barr discussed the proposal last week with Sen.

Ernest F. Hollings, D-S.C., chairman of the Senate Commerce Committee, which oversees the FCC, according to congressional sources who spoke on condition of anonymity.
Justice Department spokesman Paul McNulty refused to comment on the proposal.
The bill was drafted by the FBI and the Justice Department in response to dramatic changes in telephone technology that make it difficult for traditional wiretapping methods to pick up conversations between two parties on a telephone line.
The Justice Department's draft proposal states that the widespread use of digital transmission, fiber-optics and other technologies "make it increasingly difficult

Fifteen sheriff's deputies and several Idaho State Police officers, decked in camouflage and heavily armed, responded and set up a command post in the Dry Gulch area.
Authorities summoned an ISP tactical team from Boise, but officers did not arrive before the situation was defused.
Four deputies set up around the house and watched through a window as the man walked from room to room, Twin Falls

Pro clowns not amused by boozing bozo image

NEW YORK — Krusty the Clown was bad. Homer the Clown was worse.
But "Shakes The Clown," an alcoholic womanizer featured in a new movie, has wiped the painted smiles off clowns nationwide. They're angered by an outbreak of "clown-bushing."
"They give clowns a bad name," said Joe Barney, a 20-year veteran of the clown game. "This is something we feel very strongly about. When we're in makeup, we don't drink, smoke or swear.... we're in character."
That character, the clowns say, has nothing in common with the recent portrayals of grasping derelicts. The most recent example is "Shakes The Clown," an upcoming film starring comedian Bob Goldthwait as a boozing bozo with a coke-snorting pal named Binky.

"Shakes," which opens this month, has upset clowns from the Clown College in Venice, Fla., to the Clown Hall of Fame in Delevan, Wis. Goldthwait is not surprised he's upset some of red nose-white face set.
"It's pretty easy to step on somebody's toes when they're sporting size 32 loongs," said Goldthwait.
Shakes is the latest in a rash of nasty clown portrayals on television and in the movies, said Barney, a member of the Stratford, Conn., chapter of Clowns of America International, a conglomeration of about 5,000 clowns.
Krusty the Clown, the park-peddling kiddie show host on "The Simpsons," was shown in a recent episode as a heavy gambler. Homer the Clown, a recurring character on "In Living Color," is renowned for bopping his youthful audience on the head and telling them, "Honey don't play that." Pennywise was in

clown who lured children to their deaths in the television miniseries "It."
"We used to be called 'Bozoes,' which wasn't bad — kind of a generic name," said Barney. "But now, kids tend to be frightened, or they're all calling us 'Honey.' It's become much more difficult to perform in the '90s."
And now, there's "Shakes," a chronic alcoholic who awakes each morning with a hangover as big as his painted-on smile, according to promotional material for the film.
Goldthwait is not at all sorry about "Shakes."
"When I see clowns, I don't think, 'There's someone bringing joy into people's lives.' I think, 'There's a convicted felon. There's a guy with a past.'" Goldthwait said.
"I don't think clowns are funny. No kids, think they're funny. That's why clowns are always playing hospitals — the kids can't get up and run away."

Taxpayers keep tax withholding at same rate

WASHINGTON (AP) — Large numbers of American workers are saying "no, thanks" to President Bush's election-year offer of a bit more take-home pay now in exchange for smaller tax refunds next year.

An informal survey by The Associated Press of large employers and payroll-preparation services shows that in some companies nearly half the workers are filing new W-4 forms to keep income-tax withholding at last year's level.

If that trend holds, it would do serious damage to Bush's idea of injecting an extra \$2 billion a month into the economy simply by giving workers part of their tax refunds in advance.

"Something tells me a number of taxpayers may take me up on this one," Bush said when he announced the change during his Jan. 28 State of the Union message.

Families he said need the extra money now to help pay for clothing, college or to get a new car. The change generally took effect March 1. But it

turns out that while a lot of families might be able to use an extra \$6 or \$7 a week, they prefer to let the government hold it and send it back in a lump-sum early next year.

The difference in refund — or in taxes owed at filing time — is about \$172 a year for a single person, \$345 for a married person and \$690 for a two-earner couple.

"Large numbers of our workers are having their withholding changed to nullify the effects of the reduction," said Paul Allen at Eastman Kodak headquarters in Rochester, N.Y. "We can't quantify it yet, but the payroll department tells me it's the majority of the 39,600 employees."

A significant number of DuPont's 20,000 employees in the Wilmington, Del., area won't accept lower withholding, a spokesman said.

Huttmakr Curtis employs about 6,700 at its Kansas City headquarters and as many as 40 percent of them have requested that last year's higher

withholding rates be retained, said spokesman Adrienne Lallo.

"But the number of new W-4s is not as prevalent in our field offices, where they probably are not as aware of the change as we are at headquarters," she said.

Other employers and tax experts agree that millions of workers aren't aware that their withholding rates dropped automatically on paychecks issued after Feb. 28.

About half the more than 100,000 workers for 4,100 employers whose checks are prepared by Paychex Inc. of Fairfax, Va., are opting to keep taxes withheld at last year's higher rates, said spokesman Brian Tombs.

"We put out a communication a week or so ago to our employees, indicating the range of impact if they don't file new W-4s," said Alan Jones, a payroll official at Tennessee Eastman in Kingsport, Tenn. "It's too soon to know" whether a lot of the 13,000 workers will choose to keep their withholding

IRS chases taxes from scholarships

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP) — The government is worried that college students may be cheating — on their taxes.

Any portion of a scholarship applied to room and board or travel has been taxable since 1987, assuming the recipient already earns above a certain minimum.

"There is a concern that many taxpayers don't know the room and board portion of the scholarship is taxable income," said Gail Ellis, a spokeswoman for the Internal Revenue Service.

The agency last month collected information from Harvard University on scholarship recipients, university officials confirmed.

Students are indignant.

"This is really frightening, to try to use the IRS to beat on students," said Selena Dong, legislative director of the U.S. Student Association. "Students are barely able to meet college costs and all of a sudden there's this new, tough IRS position on scholarships. It's incredibly frustrating."

Schools are not required to report financial aid directly to the IRS. Instead, students are expected to disclose it under "wages, salaries and tips" on tax forms, Ellis said.

Those who haven't could be assessed the amount due plus penalties of up to 25 percent of the unpaid tax.

Financial "aid" applied to books, supplies and tuition remain tax-free, said Marianna Pierce, a Harvard attorney. She acknowledged that the school turned over files on 3,500 scholarship recipients from the calendar year 1989 in early February.

Hepatitis rises in gay men

ATLANTA (AP) — Federal health officials on Thursday reported outbreaks of hepatitis A among homosexual men, who have not historically been at high risk for the viral liver disease.

Researchers with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control said that features of the outbreaks in several cities could signal a resurgence of unsafe sex, a decade after concern over AIDS prompted changes in sexual behavior.

Hepatitis A typically enters the body orally, through lapses in hygiene that result in contact with fecal matter, such as in day-care centers or homes with children in diapers. But some forms of anal sex also could cause similar contamination, the CDC said.

Rules will protect telephone customers

BOISE — Idaho utility regulators have adopted rules designed to protect telephone customers from unauthorized charges run up by jail or prison inmates on pay phones.

Inmates generally are only allowed to make collect calls from pay phones, and jail or prisons often get as much as a 25-percent commission on the calls.

The new Idaho Public Utilities Commission rules, adopted Thursday, are aimed at protecting people receiving inmate calls from being charged for unwanted, unaccepted and uncompleted calls.

Clarkston man admits dunking car

LEWISTON — A Clarkston, Wash., man has claimed ownership of a 1979 Cadillac that was pulled out of the Snake River Tuesday near a Lewiston boat ramp.

David Brockman, 20, told Lewiston police he intentionally ran the car into the river after a Christmas Day argument with his girlfriend in 1990.

The car was discovered on the third day of a drawdown of Lower Granite Reservoir The U.S. Corps of Engineers is conducting the month-long test to help endangered salmon runs.

House OKs education budget

BOISE — With just three opposing votes, the Idaho House on Thursday approved a \$139 million higher education budget and sent it to Gov. Cecil Andrus.

The spending plan was \$500,000 more than the governor recommended, and there was talk earlier that the House might vote it down as it did the public school appropriation.

But after only a few minutes of debate, the bill passed with only Sandpoint Democrats Jim Stojichoff and Monica Beaudoin and Republican Fred Tilman of Boise voting no. It cleared the Senate earlier on a 40-2 vote.

Treasurer's husband will face charge

SANDPOINT — The husband of the Bonner County treasurer will turn himself in to authorities in connection with more than \$38,000 missing from Schweitzer Mountain Resort, Sheriff Chip Roos said.

A warrant was issued Wednesday for the arrest of Glenn Weldon of Sandpoint. Weldon is married to County Treasurer Karen Weldon.

"We've been in contact with him and he's on his way back," Roos said Wednesday.

Banks won't be open on Saturdays

BOISE — Small banks won't over the big banking chains Thursday when the House Business Committee voted 10-5 against a bill allowing banks to open on Saturday.

Although representatives of some of the state's biggest bank chains testified earlier in the week that their customers want and need banks to be open Saturdays, committee members apparently were swayed by letters from bank employees saying they didn't want to work weekends.

Bill would make sales harder to block

BOISE — Anyone seeking a court order blocking a state timber sale would have to put up a bond of 20 percent of the value of the timber sale under a bill approved by the Idaho House and sent to the Senate.

Opponents argued the figure was too high and would only invite national environmental organizations such as the Sierra Club to get involved in Idaho timber sale disputes.

Report: Idaho last in preschool spending

BOISE (AP) — An advocacy group's new report places Idaho last nationally in state spending on preschool, child care and development.

It comes as no surprise to Gov. Cecil Andrus or state Head Start officials.

The Children's Defense Fund released a 50-state survey on Thursday outlining state expenditures for Head Start and other child care and preschool education programs in 1990.

It found that half the states spent \$25 or less per youngster in fiscal 1990. Expenditures ranged from 24 cents per child in Idaho to \$152.04 in Massachusetts.

But even the 10 most generous in spending fail to serve many children and families, the Children's Defense Fund said.

"That just shows what a deplorable job that we have done in allocation of resources to children, and that's what I have been telling the Legislature and the people for many, many years," Andrus said of Idaho's support level. "If we really want strong, educated, capable adults, we've got to make an investment in our children."

Idaho also was among only four states in the Children's Defense Fund survey that spent no state money in 1990 on child care or development programs for youngsters who were not under the protection of the state or whose parents were not on welfare.

The federal government does provide about \$9 million annually for the 12 local Head Start programs throughout Idaho. About 2,300 children participate, said Charles

Brown, administrator of the Idaho Collaboration Office, which oversees Head Start programs statewide.

"That works out to about \$3,900 per child. But Brown said only one-third to half of the eligible children in Idaho are being served by Head Start, and state funding might be requested in the future to help more take advantage of the program's comprehensive services.

"There's a real need for that because we know that many kids aren't being served," Brown said. "Other states in the region either have state funds supporting existing programs or they have created state programs that parallel Head Start. We have no such programs in Idaho."

President Bush has proposed a \$600 million increase in the federal share for Head Start, a preschool program that provides meals, health screening, counseling and other services to 3- to 5-year-olds.

Children's Defense Fund President Marian Wright Edelman said there must be immediate action to "guarantee every eligible child a head start by 1995."

The lower priority given to such programs by the states undermines the national goal of ensuring that all children enter school ready to learn by the year 2000, she said.

In fact, she said the survey also found that Idaho and 10 other states spent at least 24 times as much on corrections and prisons as they did on child care. The others were Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, South Dakota, Tennessee and Virginia.

"We think these are backwards priorities," Ms. Edelman said. "We think there's a need to spend more on the front end so we don't need to spend more on the back end, such as prisons."

Court rules on sentence

BOISE (AP) — A criminal defendant who violates probation must receive credit for time served before the sentence was imposed, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

The court on Thursday ruled partially in favor of Dwayne Banks, sent to prison after he violated probation on a rape sentence.

But the court said the 34 days he served in jail after being sentenced doesn't count toward his sentence of up to five years in a Canyon County prison.

In another case, the Court of Appeals held that a prison official may use the force necessary when an inmate gets out of line, and need not wait until disturbances reach dangerous proportions before responding.

State prison inmate Gary Garzee claimed a correctional officer used excessive force in a dispute over Garzee's personal property.

Reapportionment: It's baaa-ack

Idaho Legislature 1992

BOISE—The 1992 reapportionment plan, hustled through the Legislature in few hours last Friday, will have to be amended because the lawmakers gave the same precinct in Minidoka County to two different legislative districts.

Rep. Pam Ahrens, R-Boise, said Thursday an area of Minidoka County inadvertently was listed in two legislative districts.

She said Susan Bennion of the Legislative Council staff was preparing an amendment to correct the problem. Bennion said the legal description covered part of Rupert Fremont, which was divided between legislative districts 24 and 25 in the new map plan.

District 24 includes Jerome and most of Minidoka County. District 25 includes Cassia County, two precincts in eastern Twin Falls County and several precincts in southern Minidoka County.

Ahrens said the amendment is not expected to make substantial changes in the reapportionment plan.

The Legislature approved a 35-district reapportionment plan last Friday and it was signed into law by Gov. Cecil Andrus on Monday.

At about the same time, 4th District Judge Robert Newhouse said the plan was presumed constitutional, and he took no immediate action in a reapportionment lawsuit to block the upcoming primary election.

Meanwhile, the Democratic Central Committee chairman of the state's largest area county said the new plan is bad news.

Darren Fales said the plan creates an impossible situation regarding representation for Idaho County in the state Legislature.

Fales said it will be difficult to elect lawmakers from Idaho County, which was cut in two in the new law.

"The way they've drawn those lines leaves us with such a small population base in the overall district it leaves us practically voiceless," he said.

And Fales said the southern half of the county has little in common with its neighboring northern district, which includes Adams Valley, Boise and Camanche counties.

"We're going to have such broad representation of concerns it would have to be responsible to represent all those interests as a legislator," Fales said.

Jerry Wren of Cottonwood, vice chairman of the Idaho County Republican Central Committee, reserved judgment on the issue. The new reapportionment leaves Cottonwood and the county's western portion connected with northern districts.

"It's going to be new and different and I haven't really formed an opinion as to what the significance of it is," Wren said.

Albertson College will cut graduate courses

ALDWELL—Albertson College says it will drop almost all of its graduate programs over the next three years to focus on liberal arts courses.

The transition is to be complete by June of 1995, school officials said Thursday. The college plans one narrowly focused graduate program, a full-time master's program in teaching program for liberal arts graduates who wish to become kindergarten-through-12th-grade teachers.

Albertson College currently offers graduate studies in school administration, elementary education and counseling at Caldwell and at satellite facilities at Mountain Home and Twin Falls.

Albertson Mountain Home facility has seen low enrollment and will be phased out, but on a different schedule than current graduate programs. Mountain Home and the Twin Falls facility last year was tabbed for elimination by June 1994.

Boise lawmaker likes chance for election consolidation bill

BOISE—For Rep. Pam Ahrens, R-Boise, persistence pays off.

For four years, one of Ahrens' pet causes has been election consolidation. Last year an election-consolidation bill she sponsored passed the House but was killed in the Senate.

On Thursday, however, the House passed a bill Ahrens predicted has the right stuff to win Senate approval and passage here.

The bill would limit all taxing districts, except school and water districts, to holding elections on one of four days of the year: the first Tuesday in February, the fourth Tuesday in May, the first Tuesday in August, and the Tuesday following the first Monday in November.

The bill would also provide uniform rules for conducting elections, provide that a person who registered in one district would automatically be registered in every other district he lives in, and, wherever possible, require that polling places be the same between districts.

School districts were exempted because limiting their ability to call elections could interfere with teacher contracts and affect their bond ratings, Ahrens said.

House committee waylays student press freedom bill

BOISE—Two days after a House committee seemed ready to endorse a bill to guarantee the free expression rights of students, the panel instead decided that the bill needed more work.

The bill, sponsored by state Rep. Millie Plandor, D-Pocatello, would strictly limit the power of principals, superintendents and other school administrators to censor student publications or require that they review them before publication.

Plandor began work on the bill last year at the behest of the Idaho Journalism Advisers Association. Interest in it increased after an incident last December in Meridian, when the Meridian High School newspaper was prevented from running a story about a sex-education protest at the school.

On Tuesday, after several high-school journalism students testified in favor of the bill, it seemed assured of swift passage out of the House Judiciary, Rules and Administration Committee. The vote was postponed because some absent committee members wanted to be present for it.

But Thursday, after Meridian Assistant Superintendent Bob Haley defended the right of administrators to exert editorial control over school papers, some members had second thoughts.

Haley said that Meridian Principal Gil Koga did not actually prohibit the student newspaper.

Twin Falls pedestrian injuries jump by more than 60%

TWIN FALLS—For the second year in a row, no pedestrians were killed in Twin Falls traffic accidents last year, but pedestrian injuries climbed more than 60 percent.

Drivers need to be more aware of pedestrians, especially in high risk areas such as intersections and near schools, said Cpl. David Heidemann, the head of the city's Accident Reduction Team.

Heidemann recently compiled pedestrian accident figures for the American Automobile Association.

The city received an award from the AAA last year for having only nine pedestrian injuries and no deaths in 1990.

Heidemann said. But the number of injured pedestrians rose to 15 last year, and that is generally the fault of drivers, he said.

The increase in pedestrian injuries climbed in the same year that total traffic injuries decreased from 406 to 259.

The city is making an "honest effort" to reduce pedestrian accidents, especially when designing new intersections, Heidemann said. New intersections have curb cuts and crosswalks to make crossing the street easier, especially for handicapped people, he said.

"Most pedestrian injuries occur during the daytime, according to Heidemann's report. Only five injuries happened at night, with nine between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. and one unknown.

Wood River residents cry foul over tax burden

HAILEY—Ritu Shivdasani says several years ago she began to realize that Blaine County residents were paying an unfair share of taxes toward education.

Shivdasani says she became aware of a problem in her community in December of 1990 when she stumbled upon some facts: Blaine County only receives about \$239 per student from the state compared to about \$1,500 throughout the rest of Idaho.

Shivdasani became concerned enough to form a grassroots citizens group to do something about the problem.

The Sun Valley resident fortified Blaine County Citizens for Education that makes regular treks to Boise to put pressure on lawmakers to lessen the load on Wood River Valley taxpayers.

Stennett's resolution requests that 60 Idaho school districts be forced to fund more than 80 percent of its budget.

Blaine County receives only 18 percent state funding for education. If Stennett's resolution becomes law, Blaine County would receive 20 percent state funding.

Modified Truth-In-Taxation bill sent to Andrus

BOISE—Modification of the controversial Truth-In-Taxation bill that triggered the initiative to cap all property taxes at 1 percent of actual market value has won final legislative approval.

The Senate voted 34-7 on Thursday to send the measure to Gov. Cecil Andrus. It cleared the House last month without opposition.

The bill is a partial response to the outcry that followed 1991's repeal of the last vestige of the 1978 property tax revolt—a 5 percent cap on annual property tax levy or property tax budget increases by local governments and school districts.

Truth in Taxation replaced the cap,

creating a scheme under which local government could make unrestricted financial decisions but would have to take huge newspaper advertisements and hold a public hearing any time they wanted to raise the property tax level. Those ads have to explain the financial impact of the levy hike on property owners.

The legislation sent to Andrus on Thursday imposes the same hearing and advertising requirement if the local government plans to increase its spending by 5 percent.

Opponents of the cap's repeal claim it will open hard-pressed property owners to skyrocketing taxes they believe are already excessive. Local officials did little to dispute that concern last year when property

assessments in many counties soared and local officials approved pay increases for themselves.

They maintained some restriction on annual local spending is critical as a safety net for homeowners.

Backers of the Truth in Taxation concept, citing its success in other states like Utah, claimed the old 5 percent cap was actually a 5 percent floor that forced local governments to adapt the maximum increase every year whether they needed it or not.

It also forced legislative approval of exceptions—the cap—for critical expenditures like indigent health care and creation of new government entities with their own taxing authority.

Those entities would take over

operations general governments could no longer afford under the cap.

The result, supporters of the cap's repeal claimed, was that property taxes actually rose at an annual rate of 7 percent while the restriction was in effect.

In Utah under Truth in Taxation, they claimed, annual property tax increases actually declined from as much as 12 percent to only 3 percent once citizens received adequate notice and got involved.

"The only purpose for Truth in Taxation is to decrease property taxes," Senate tax committee Chairman Jerry Stenett, R-Nampa, said.

Testimony ends in Stafford trial; final arguments set for today

TWIN FALLS — The case of a Twin Falls veterinarian accused of defrauding a client will finally go to the jury today.

Closing arguments will begin at 9 a.m. today in one of the strangest cases to show up in 5th District Court recently.

David J. Stanton, 46, is charged with one count of grand theft by deception involving a leg injury suffered by a rooster named "Duke" two years ago.

Stafford, who did not testify, defended himself to the charge.

Depending on which side you believe, the dog suffered either a broken right rear leg or a dislocated hip when her owner, Gary Thietten of Twin Falls, backed over her with a heat trailer in March 1990.

Thietten says his regular veterinarian couldn't be reached, so he took his dog, Whitney, to Stafford who took X-rays and kept the dog overnight.

According to prosecutors, Stafford later told Thietten he had a fracture and needed to operate. Thietten OK'd the operation and later paid \$477 for

the surgery to repair Whitney's broken leg.

Whitney ended up at the Green Acres Pet Center a few days later for an unrelated condition — she had a rock in her stomach — and veterinarians there say they could find no evidence of a broken bone or surgery, only a dislocated hip.

Another surgery was performed, during which Green Acres vet William Strickland removed some of the bone from Whitney's femur to repair the dislocation.

By then, the Twin Falls County sheriff's office had become involved, and the surgery was videotaped in the presence of investigator Bill Tilton.

The jury watched that videotape last week.

During Thursday's final day of testimony, Whitney showed up in court, apparently healthy and walking on all fours.

Deputy Idaho Attorney General Michael Henderson called Jack Jaquess from the Idaho Department of Law Enforcement as a rebuttal witness.

Jaquess said he analyzed handwriting from 10 people involved in the case, including Stafford and other veterinarians, and he couldn't determine who wrote on the labels.

Idaho fights Energy Department appeal

SEATTLE (AP) — The state of Idaho wants a federal appeals court to reject the U.S. Department of Energy's claim that it is not required to comply with state environmental requirements for the storage of nuclear waste.

Idaho filed a petition with the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals Friday to challenge the Energy Department's appeal of a judge's order requiring a state quality permit before it stores more high-level radioactive material at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

The Energy Department already has an air quality permit for the storage facility at the INEL's Idaho neutronics processing plant and contends no additional permits are needed to continue using it. But Judge accepted the state's argument that a new permit is required any time a modification occurs that results in an increase in air emissions.

Besides the Energy Department's appeal of that decision, the appellate court panel also was expected to hear arguments Friday on Lodge's refusal to allow Public Service Co. of Colorado, which owns the Fort St. Vrain nuclear plant, to intervene in the case.

Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus has been battling the Energy Department for years over its storage of high-level radioactive waste at the INEL in eastern Idaho west of Idaho Falls. The agency contends its sprawling nuclear engineering and research reservation is the best place to store the material until a permanent repository can be found. But Andrus contends Energy Department officials have misled Idaho and not tried hard enough to find alternatives to INEL storage.

Nalizer's resolution asks that a cost-of-living index be included in the state education formula.

Hailey resident Tina McNeal, a Shiversian, says she is much less likely to live in Blaine County than elsewhere in the state, even if average incomes are similar.

According to McNeal, Blaine County's median income is \$2,000 less than Ada County, but median mortgage payments are \$400 per month or \$4,800 per year more.

At the time Shiversian first became concerned, there were no proposals by legislators in Boise to shut school districts from using overrides for school funding.

Blaine County taxpayers have traditionally supported overrides to help finance the schools, another factor

in January, Shiversian said a group of legislators came to Blaine County to speak in opposition in January.

Concerned residents were told they should let the Senate and House members know what they needed and supported.

Shiversian has done just that, keeping her group active in putting pressure on legislators.

During the last legislative session, 30 people made 16 trips to Boise. About 150 people are active in phone and letter campaigns.

But Haley denied that.

Some committee members, including Rep. Pam Ahrens, R-Boise, favored sending the bill directly to the House floor.

"Maybe what we're not doing is teaching the values of our

we're creating boards that all agree with the school board. And maybe if we allow our students to freely express themselves, some of that attitude will rub off on the rest of us."

But others said school administrators shouldn't be taken advantage of by the legislature, and the committee eventually will send the bill to general order, action of the House calendar for bills awaiting amendment.

Flandro said she was optimistic that any amendments would retain the principle that administrators should not have prior restraint rights over student publications.

"I have to think that the committee's intention is not to gut the bill," she said. "I honestly believe they have their hearts set in the right place. But you have to be concerned — anything can happen in general orders."

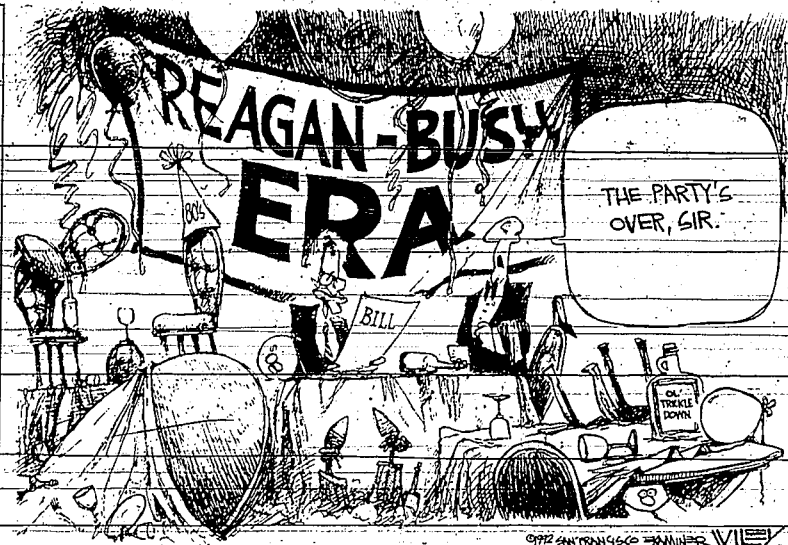

Prairie populist makes odd bedfellow for Magic Valley

Rock-ribbed conservative Magic Valleyites could be excused Wednesday for choking on their oatmeal when they perused their morning Times-News.

The winner of Tuesday night's Democratic caucuses: Iowa Sen. Tom Harkin.

It's as if you had awakened on Nov. 9, 1972, and found that George McGovern had won the Magic Valley.

Tom Harkin is no new-age, sure-we-need-less-government, I'm-not-Santa Claus Democrat. The liberal Americans for Democratic Action has never rated him below 95 percent in his eight years in the Senate. His conservative counterpart has never rated him above 5 percent.

He's a New Deal-style, soak-the-rich, more-entitlements-for-everybody-else, tax-and-spend-prairie populist, Magic Valley Democrats say they love him.

Or, at least, the ones who participated in Tuesday's caucuses loved him. Perhaps that says more about them than about Harkin.

He pulled in twice as many Democratic delegates in the Magic Valley as his nearest competitor, former Massachusetts Sen. Paul Tsongas. He'll take 22 of the Magic Valley's 48 delegates to the state convention in Lewiston, where the Idaho delegates to the Democratic National Convention will be chosen.

The people who participated in the county caucuses Tuesday night may fully represent Magic Valley Democrats at large. For the most part, they were from the committed hard-core — true believers for whom the New Frontier and the Great Society aren't yesterday's news yet.

But it would be a mistake to dismiss the Harkin phenomenon out of hand, for three reasons:

• It reflects the depth of dissatisfaction with what's going on in the country. Harkin is a socialist, and most of what he has to say is out of touch and out of date. But as the starkest alternative to George Bush, he's the clearest alternative for some people.

• The second is that agriculture, a safely Republican preserve in the Magic Valley since Ira Perrine turned on the first headgate, can't be taken for granted by the GOP anymore.

It was predominantly a Willie Nelson crowd at the Magic Valley Democratic caucuses Tuesday, far more so than four years ago when Michael Dukakis won most of the delegates.

• The third is that the Idaho Rural Council, the left-leaning farm group whose members did much of the organizing for Harkin, is a force to be considered in the Magic Valley — perhaps a more potent force right now than the Democrats.

As well it demonstrates something else.

Democrats 4-for-11 in presidential elections since the end of World War II, are still wandering in the wilderness.

Harkin can't be elected, any more than McGovern could 20 years ago or Walter Mondale could in 1984. The

American people have long since passed by Harkin and his I'm-from-the-government-and-I'm-here-to-give-you-something ideas.

But his supporters — astonishingly — still don't get it. They succeeded in sending a message Tuesday, but that's a long way from running a country.

Private breeders are the future

The Jerome Game Farm is up for lease. A better idea would be for the state to subsidize the farm for private individuals. How would we subsidize the farm?

• Pheasant stamp money that goes into the HIP program.

• Cut down research grants that may be done more economically on the farm. A case in point — the \$40,000 being spent to study mountain quail.

• Buy the state management area birds from the farm — approximately \$50,000 a year, which buys only 5,000 birds.

• The farm, if put in condition, could produce the birds for \$6 or less. The farm is run down and the incubators are out of date.

Upland game is a good resource. A good game population pays for itself with increased hunting and benefits the communities.

When we consider what other states are doing, we are far behind in game-bird management. Even some pheasant organizations that are habitat-oriented are spending money in Wisconsin to plant birds.

The state of Illinois has built one of the best breeder hatchery operations in the United States — hatching 35,000 chicks a week for their management area.

Hatchability from 7,000 breeders is more than 80 percent.

The state of Washington buys 40,000 birds for release. Rhode Island and New York puts out a good number of birds.

Michigan is doing well with the Sichuan import. Oregon is doing well with the Red Leg. Kansas, North Dakota, Iowa and South Dakota are vigorous in game-bird population.

What are we doing? Where are we going? Mostly to other states.

The technology in game population is available. We have public land and private land, water and hunting. We have to change our way of thinking. Private breeders are the future for Idaho; they are for other good pheasant states.

If we can save the whale, condor and crane, we sure can save upland game. Upland game pays for itself and helps everyone.

In less than five years, some breeders have expanded and hatched more than a half-million chicks a year.

Why doesn't Magic Valley get any purchased pheasants? Call your game commissioner.

Most deaf people living in this area are either hard of hearing or have hearing children. They can depend on their hearing children to call for them. But what about those ones who cannot hear at all and depend on the TDDs and answering or relay services?

The vet said it was a type of rat poison. You can't buy it at a store. The vet also said if I could get hold of this, it could be fatal.

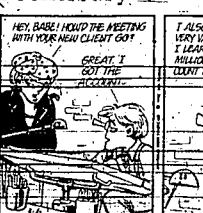

Should Serb army seize control of Bosnia?

SARAJEVO, Yugoslavia — The Serb-dominated federal army must take control of Bosnia-Herzegovina to prevent more ethnic violence following the independence referendum approved by Muslims and Croats, Serb leaders said Thursday.

Tens of thousands of federal troops are stationed throughout Bosnia, making the status of the military force a crucial issue.

It is also important because of the critical role the Yugoslav army played in the civil war in Croatia, which broke out after that republic declared independence in June. The army sided with Serb militants against Croat fighters and together they captured one-third of Croatia before last month's truce.

Another potentially explosive issue is whether

other countries recognize the independence of Bosnia, as they did for Croatia and Slovenia.

Serbian leader Radovan Karadzic warned the European Community Thursday not to recognize Bosnia before representatives of the republics' three ethnic groups — Muslims, Croats and Serbs — meet over the weekend to try and agree on territorial partition.

"If the EC pushes this, no one will be able to prevent civil war in Bosnia," he told a news conference.

Karadzic, a close ally of Serbia's leader, Slobodan Milosevic, also urged the federal army to intervene, saying the policies of Bosnia's Muslim president, Alija Izetbegovic, were "leading to chaos."

He read a statement by the Serbian Democratic Party saying: "Bosnian authorities and the federal army must take control and prevent further chaos."

An aide, Biljana Plavcic, told The Associated Press an agreement was made two months ago that the military should "help" prevent civil war in Bosnia.

But Gen. Milutin Kukanjac, commander of the army in Bosnia, said Wednesday the army would not intervene.

Of the six Yugoslav republics, only long-dominated Serbia and tiny Montenegro now want to remain part of the Yugoslav federation. Bosnia, a mountainous republic that is one-third Serb, lies between Croatia and Serbia.

Deputy governor fired following melee

BEIJING (AP) — A provincial official was fired after an investigation found him partly responsible for the deaths of 108 people crushed at an overcrowded festival in September.

An official report said Thursday. The report said the probe concluded that Li "committed serious errors" and was guilty of dereliction of duty.

Gunman kills 6 after ringing their doorbells

LUGANO, Switzerland (AP) — A gunman stalked through three villages in southern Switzerland, shooting residents as they answered the doorbell.

Six people were killed in one of the worst mass murders in Swiss history.

Toting a semi-automatic rifle, the 37-year-old gunman burst in on one family as it ate dinner and shot other victims on their doorsteps during the two-hour spree Wednesday evening, police said.

The gunman surrendered in tears after the rampage in the villages of Rivera, Origgio and Massagno, which left six people wounded, some seriously.

The bloodshed marked the third time in as many years that this normally placid country has been rocked by a multiple slaying.

Critics have blamed gun laws so varied that in some areas sub-machine guns can be bought without a permit.

Police said they had no idea what motivated Wednesday's killings and would not say if the gunman, Erminio Cassione, knew his victims. They said he lived in the Swiss-canton (state) of Ticino, near the Italian border.

But villagers said he had worked in the butcher shop in Rivera about 13 years ago and had contacts with the people he shot. The six people killed were from two families in Rivera.

Stalinists mark late leader's passing

MOSCOW (AP) — "Comrade Stalin was right!" proclaimed a hand-written sign propped up near Red Square, where a small crowd gathered Thursday to commemorate the 39th anniversary of the Soviet dictator's death.

For many, the name Josef Stalin is synonymous with brutality and he is widely blamed for killing millions of his own people. But for the roughly 300 million who gathered to lay flowers at his Kremlin grave, Stalin was the greatest, kindest and smartest politician of all time.

"Stalin was a very good man. Nobody in the entire world is better than Stalin was," said Varvara Piliushvili, a retired history teacher.

Authorities seal mine

KOZLU, Turkey (AP) — Despite appeals from weeping family members waiting at the surface, officials sealed off the Kozlu coal mine Thursday, ending all hope for 148 miners trapped one-third of a mile underground.

In Turkey's worst mine disaster, officials said 122 bodies have been recovered following Tuesday's methane gas explosion. Seventy-five miners were injured but escaped death in the disaster 120 miles north of Ankara.

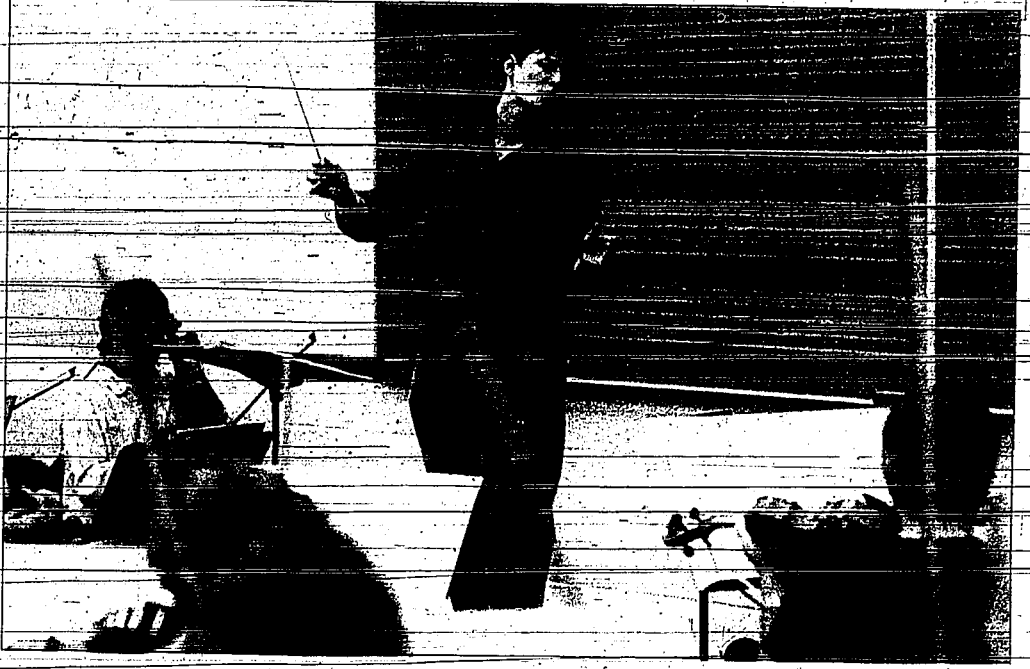

She advises parents to schedule private lessons for children interested in music, and to select teachers of high professional levels.

But what about fun? Myers loves classical music, but she also loves jazz. And, believe it or not, she has recently come to love country and western music, to the tune of Garth Brooks and Emmylou Harris.

"I guess it's just hard to avoid enjoying country music in Idaho," she said.

'Wayne's World' may spur more TV adaptations

LOS ANGELES — The metal-head teens of "Wayne's World" and the creepy clan who make up "The Addams Family" are hits on the big screen and certain to send movie producers scrambling for more television fare.

Hollywood has tried to make money from the tube since the beginning of national television, with lots of success over the years. But not all small-screen offerings are easily — and lucratively — adapted.

The 1990 Paramount Pictures released "The Godfather" based on the popular television sitcom created by Gertrude Berg. The movie failed and a name change to "Molly" didn't help.

Warner Bros. tried to transfer Milton Berle's immense television popularity to theaters in 1949 with "Always Leave Them

Laughing, "loosely based on his show. Paying audiences didn't respond.

Then came "The Untouchables," six "Star Trek" movies and "The Naked Gun," followed by a sequel. All generated millions and all were based on television shows.

"Wayne's World," adapted from a winning sitcom on NBC's "Saturday Night Live," has astounded the movie trade by leading the box office list.

Although the TV show's late-night

audience is about one-third that of a prime-time series, "Wayne's World" fans and others bought \$33 million worth of tickets in the first 10 days of release in the United States and Canada.

"We're not surprised," said Barry London, marketing chief for Paramount, which released the film about two heavy marketing tests who host a cable access show from a basement in Aurora, Ill.

"There are a lot of reasons why the film is performing well," London said. "Mainly, the young audience can laugh and have a good time. There are a lot of laughs for the 'buck'."

"The Addams Family," which appeals both to young audiences and parents who

remember the television series from the 1960s and the Charles Addams cartoon, has made \$110 million since Paramount released it last fall.

"There was appeal in seeing a family that

was not at all normal, but treated themselves as normal." Both those films were ideal for conversion to the big screen.

"The Long Goodbye of 'Wayne's World' and 'The Addams Family.'"

"They were made in black and white in the '60s under limited television budgets. A lot more things could be done, especially with the 'Star Treks.' Special effects have progressed immensely since the '60s."

Special qualities are required to make the TV-to-movie switch.

"You need a script that will have wide enough appeal to a theater audience," London said. "It all boils down to what's on the page."

Luella Ball and Desi Arnaz wisely didn't try to put "I Love Lucy" on the big screen, but they played other characters in "The Long, Long Trailer," which was a huge hit.

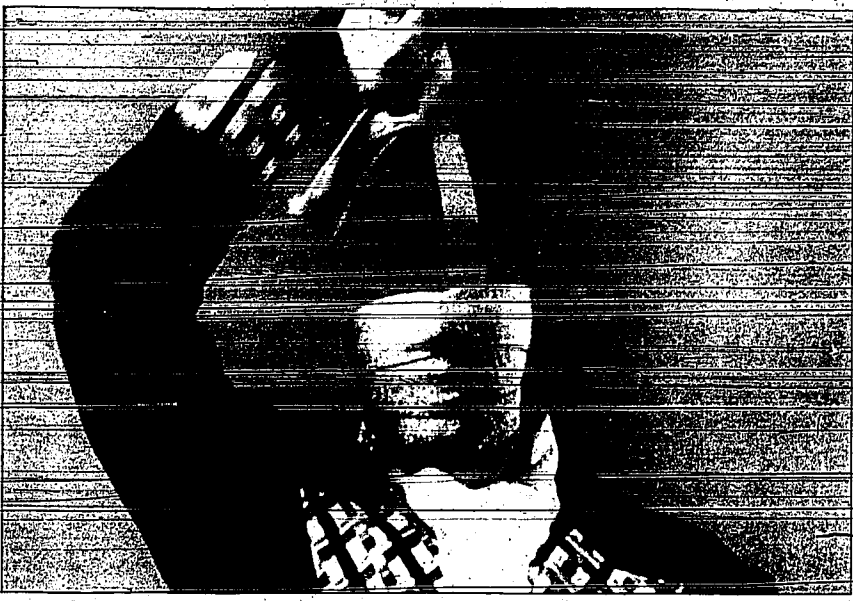

'Invisible Man'

Chevy Chase takes a shot at real acting in new film

Gosh, dam it, miracles do happen! If Chevy Chase can make a decent movie, maybe there's hope for us all. But perhaps it helps a bit that the Chevyman is invisible during 90 percent of the running time. If you can't see him, how can you hate him?

Actually, in "Memoirs of an Invisible Man," Chase tries something new: acting. Gone is the familiar exaggeration of the "Saturday Night Live" persona, the smug put-down, the snarling narcissist, so intent on letting the audience know how much better he is than the material. Here, he's just trying to be as good as the material.

Chase plays Nick Holloway, a callow San Francisco stockbroker more addicted to hedonism than heroes. Hung-over one morning and covering for a buddy at a presentation of new technology for potential investors, he manages to wander off and end up in the wrong place at the wrong time, when the machinery goes bananas. His molecules are stolen; he is turned invisible.

Congratulations to John Carpenter, the director, and Chase for avoiding the first pitfall in the PG-13-rated film, the adolescent temptations of the invisibility theme: Holloway's initial impulse isn't to head for the nearest girls' locker room but to get really depressed.

He hasn't seen anything yet. Soon, he develops, rogue CIA hotshot David Jenkins (Sam Neill under too much mousse) realizes that invisibility has applications in the intelligence field that are unlimited and sets out to snare Chase as his own asset. (Clearly, the story, derived from a novel by H.F. Saint, pre-dates the end of the Cold War; in today's cli-

mate, who would he spy on? Kyrsgystan? Tajikistan?) Thus the movie devolves into a standard-issue chase, but boy Neill and Chase, thus after good-bye Chase and his transparent atom.

The elaborate special-effects that sustain the illusion of invisibility throughout the film soon wear out. How many times can you chuckle at a pair of pants running down the street or a cigarette or a gun suddenly materializing? But the movie works well enough on two other fronts to keep it entertaining.

The first is Chase's own arc of maturation. In some sense, this is another salvation-of-a-yuppie story, similar thematically to "Regarding Henry" and "The Doctor," in which a life-threatening experience reclaims for a worthless man some grip on the part of his anatomy called the soul.

What works here is the subject of Chase's own career: It's as if this is his salvation as well as Nick Holloway's, a chance to create a full character of some complexity and humanity. This, particularly, is emphasized in his relationship with Daryl Hannah, which, as these things go in these kinds of movies, is relatively beautifully portrayed and nicely developed.

Second, the chase mechanism is older than dinosaur bones, but just as sturdy. Carpenter, once an energetic schlockstar ("Halloween"), understands the mechanism well and deploys it efficiently. Neill's hot shot strikes me as a little too pretty for the kind of work he does, but nevertheless he brings a nice psycho edge to the part that gives the film itself some edge.

"Memoirs of an Invisible Man" is a modest achievement, to be sure, but it is an achievement none the less.

Shyness becomes an asset for Daryl Hannah

NEW YORK (AP) — When Daryl Hannah was 10 years old, she was so shy and withdrawn that a doctor told her mother to put her in an institution. Instead, her mother took her to a Caribbean island.

She just let me run wild, Hannah recalls. "I had no idea why we were down there. I had a great time. I was able to adjust much better when I came back."

Despite her early island cure, Hannah, 31, never has been accused of appearing too down-to-earth. But in her case, childlike spaciousness often has proved a winning career strategy.

is a part-time mermaid in "Splash," the waif-like performance artist in "Legs"

and the fey astronomer in "Roxanne."

Hannah says her goal is "at least one good, meaty" role in the next few years. But since Hannah on-screen is very much like Hannah off-screen, minus some of the sweetness, it may be hard for casting directors to see her in more grounded roles.

During an interview in a Manhattan hotel room, Hannah is fending off a cold. She's tall and very thin with tousled blond hair hiding part of her face. She wears blue jeans, a black jersey and black combat boots.

She appears outwardly wan and fragile, but possesses a steely petu-

lance that apparently has served her well during her long journey from Caribbean isle to Los Angeles, where she lives with longtime boyfriend, rocker Jackson Browne.

Grill her for awhile and notice that there's very little talk of drug problems, broken romances, stints in rehab. The conversation veers more in the direction of "The Wizard of Oz" and winter sports.

Raised in Chicago in an affluent family, Chase says she was enthralled by "The Wizard of Oz" as a child.

"I wanted to BE in 'The Wizard of Oz,'" she says. "I wanted to BE Judy Garland."

In an era when many movie stars think fame is a license to confess all, Hannah's otherworldliness, however studied it may be, is a throwback to another time.

"I've chosen not to live my personal life in public," Hannah says. "I think my career should speak for itself. I don't go out to all those (celebrity) places because, I don't want to, I find them stressful. I don't have the desire to exploit myself. When I have time off I like to be out snowboarding or something."

Which means she won't talk about her relationship with Browne or her widely reported friendship with John F. Kennedy Jr.

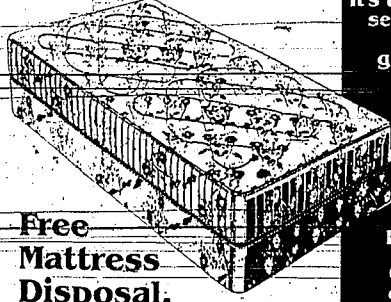

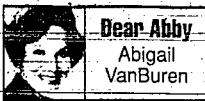

(By then I was working full-time and living on my own.) This gave us guaranteed time together on a regular basis. As it turned out, the "gift" I thought I was giving my mother, I gave to myself. My mother died suddenly six months after she retired. The memories I have from our lunches together are treasures to me.

I live in peace now at peace with myself for having "right" things

with my mother, and at peace with my caring husband and two beautiful children.

Pittsburgh girl's chronicle of life in the ghetto will be published

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Anika Thomas has written a book about the ghetto — about crack houses, crime and boarded-up buildings, about racism and despair. She has written a children's book that makes grown men cry.

Anika is 13 years old. And the world she writes about is the world she sees through the windows of her family's home.

"I sometimes wish I could be like Dorothy in 'The Wizard of Oz.' I wish a tornado would grab mom and me — and blow us far away from this other land," she writes. "But if that tornado never comes to take us away ... then I will do it myself."

Anika's autobiography, "Life in the Ghetto," was one of three winners selected from more than 7,000 submissions to the nationwide "Written and Illustrated By ..." contest sponsored by Landmark Editions Inc.

Landmark Editions has published the 29-page, hardback book; a first printing of 7,500 copies has sold out, and a second printing is under way. Anika gets a 5 percent royalty on all book sales, along with a \$5,000 scholarship.

Anika's book may be for children, but it is a cry from Dr. Seuss.

She tells of children who taunt and b — her because her skin isn't as dark as theirs even when she herself is black. She describes how drug abusers leave sad scrawls on the street outside the home she shares with her widowed mother in Pittsburgh's, rough Hill District neighborhood.

And she tells of 11 prostitutes who share the apartment below when they weren't walking the street in the front of the building.

She has illustrated her book with her own drawings — drunks, portraits of her relatives, even a depiction of that make-believe tornado.

While just gripping an American version of "The Diary of Anne Frank," said David Melech, creative coordinator for Landmark Editions Inc.

"The first time I read the book, I had tears rolling down my cheeks. I flipped back to the beginning and started reading again. It was one of the most touching documents written by a child that I've ever read."

Anika is a shy girl, but she promotes her book in visits to elementary schools throughout Pennsylvania. She presents a slide show, answers any questions the students ask. "Has she seen weapons? Are the drugs dealers dangerous?" she asked. "The answers are yes, yes, and yes — and sells copies of the book.

All the money is placed in a trust fund that will be used to pay for her college education.

If "Life in the Ghetto" is the work

of a child, in many ways it is a testimony to her mother, Barbara Jones. It was Barbara Jones who first suggested that Anika chronicle her life, but Anika gives her far more credit — it was her mother's guidance that has kept her off the streets.

"There's people getting beat up and shot at," Anika said in an interview at her middle school, High School where she is in ninth grade.

"There's needles on the sidewalk and people fighting over drugs. Some kids go behind our building if the a-kid and start drinking — smoking and using other stuff. Some were between the ages — I think — of 4 and 8."

Eventually, Anika says, she wants to move to California and attend college there, taking her mother along. Jones doesn't like the idea. As bad as it is in their neighborhood, she says she's read enough about California to know what life is like there.

"They have earthquakes and gang-bangers — or whatever they call them," she said. "And I don't like those drive-by shootings."

But Anika is undeterred. She wants to be a newspaper reporter someday. "After I graduate from college, I'm going to find a good job and I am going to get it out here," she writes at the book's end.

three have their degrees. Jones said Anika learned from her siblings, gaining maturity and direction.

Jones was always at home, having quit her job as a neurology technician in 1973 when her daughter Shonn began suffering epileptic seizures.

The book is dedicated to Jones and Shonn, who died in 1988 after falling and hitting her head during a seizure. She slipped into a coma for several days before passing away, as Anika and her mother watched.

"Miss Shonn every day," Anika writes in the book. "I loved her so much and know I always will."

Maughan, of Rupert, has been collecting information for the book during the past 10 years. He also shot most of the book's 45 photographs. At age 76, he remains, in his own words "very observant." He is enterprising too.

When I finished my first draft of the book, I took it to the ISU geology department and was thrilled to learn they were interested in publishing it," Maughan said. "They tell me they will be using it in some classes."

'Wacky' toy names will be changed

CINCINNATI (AP) — Toys with names like Puke Shooters, Spot Shot, Butt Kickers and Chuck-Blowers could soon get more appealing monikers, Kenner Products says.

The Cincinnati-based toymaker said it would respond to consumer complaints by changing the names of some of the toys in its new Savage Mondo Blitzer line.

But the company declined to say which toys will be renamed or how soon the renamed versions will reach stores, and a critic said the name change would be only a cosmetic solution.

The toys are plastic figures that roll on wheels. They don't do what their names imply, but have gross-looking faces, and carry weapons in threatening poses.

"It's a very, very poor response. It still doesn't cover their

obligation to produce positive toys that create positive self-images for children," said Sharon Cooley, a first-grade teacher in suburban Loveland.

Cooley and several colleagues at Mann Elementary School complained to Kenner that the toys are vulgar and suggest to children that violence is acceptable.

Kenner said it received no consumer complaints about the toys during last year's marketing in Indianapolis in January and February, and sales exceeded the company's expectations. The company began selling the toys nationally two weeks ago.

Kenner, owned by Hasbro Inc. of Pawtucket, R.I., said the toys were "fun, wacky and humorous characters on wheels to appeal to boys who enjoy action figures and vehicle play."

Visiting artist inspires young puppeteers

HAZELTON Clay Martin makes his living by putting on artificial dramatic performances.

In other words, he's a puppeteer.

As Valley School District's artist-in-residence, Martin shows the students the different types of puppets, tells some of the history of puppetry and helps them create their own puppet show.

The children have to choose a story or make one up, create the puppets and scenes and perform it in front of the class. Martin prefers the kids have two or three scenes in their two- to five-minute show.

Their stages will be shoe boxes resting lengthwise with the front and back sides cut out to allow for scene changes and puppet entrances and exits.

The characters are a mix of cardboard and construction paper and are attached to the puppet sticks on long cardboard pieces cut out from the front side to slide or drop in from the stage, depending on the action of the story.

If drawing isn't a strong point for a student, Martin encourages him or

her to copy or trace the image they want.

This type of approach has been successful, according to Martin, "because they get to try all the jobs, writing, making the puppets and the scenes...and performing."

Martin said some of the ideas have been very original and told of one fourth-grader he taught who chose the inside of a human torso as the background. The puppets were a longly sausage, other pieces of food, and a pepperoni, who marries the sausage.

He said most of the kids come up with good ideas and find some aspect of the project in which they have a strength.

Puppets are useful in many areas, and Martin said he's currently working on incorporating puppets with live actors performing a series of Grimm's Fairy Tales.

"We think of puppets as kids stuff here (in the United States)," Martin said. He explained that in other countries, puppets keep old legends and folk lore alive.

Martin began working with puppets 12 years ago, although he did put on a puppet show at age 8. When

Martin was in his mid-20s and living in Germany, he met Rolf Trexler, who hired him and gave him some sense of the history of puppetry.

Back in the United States, Martin worked with Burr Tillstrom of Ketchikan, Fran and Olive Bove and learned how to make puppets, do behind-

the-scenes work and improvise with the puppets.

Based in Seattle now, Martin travels all over the country to festivals, schools, libraries and theaters to perform his trade. The only thing he finds surprising is that "I can make a living doing this."

Mushers reach Iditarod's halfway point

CRIPPLE, Alaska (AP) — Doug Swingley was the first musher to reach the halfway point in the Iditarod sled dog race today, beating former champion Joe Runyan by one minute to take a \$3,000 prize of silver ingots.

Swingley arrived at 5:20 a.m. at Cripple, 534 miles into the 1,159-mile race. But neither leader had taken their required 24-hour rest stops, and they were being chased by a group of mushers who had.

Leading the challengers was DeDee Jonrowe, who reached Ophir, 60 miles back, at 1:25 a.m. Last year's second-place finisher, Martin Buser, got into Ophir at 3:25 a.m. race officials said. Both had taken their required layovers.

Musher Bill Cotter also had arrived at Ophir, but he had not rested and was still there early Thursday.

For the leaders, the marathon from Anchorage to Nome is expected to end by the middle of next week. Temperatures in interior Alaska were in the 30s and 40s below zero, with wind chills well below that.

Race officials said mushers were cruising through another checkpoint at Takotna, between McGrath and Ophir, without stopping.

Close behind were Kelli Reitan, Martin Buser, Tim Osmar, Frank Tansley, Bruce Lee and Jeff King and about a dozen other mushers.

Runyan, of Nenana, grabbed the lead early Wednesday on the way to the McGrath checkpoint.

Swenson gave her a ride for about an hour until she found her team.

"I lost time, and I know Rick lost time, but I'll tell you what: He was a real hero in my book," Jonrowe said. "It certainly put the safety of the dogs before anything else."

Twenty-six mushers began the race Saturday. First prize is \$50,000.

The race's oldest musher, 86-year-old Norman Vaughan, quit Wednesday.

Cold weather continued, with temperatures reaching no higher than minus 10 or minus 5 degrees, and dipping as low as 40 below zero. Winds gusted as high as 10 or 15 mph.

Also on Wednesday, the Humane Society of the United States condemned the death of a dog in musher Kaymie Redington's team. The dog died on the trail in Skwentna, where Redington won a \$25,000 pickup truck for arriving first.

Race officials said the dog died of a heart condition, which could not have been foreseen.

Humano Society vice president David Wells, however, said he was "very concerned a dog was lost on the way for the truck," and called for more thorough pre-race examinations.

Pistons' 'freak' sets team rebound mark

AUBURN HILLS, Mich. (AP) — The rebounding freak was it again, taking on the records of Hall of Fame players and beating them off the boards.

This time, Dennis Rodman could not be caught, and set a Detroit Pistons' record with 34 rebounds in an overtime victory against the Indiana Pacers.

"He's a freak, a freak of nature," Pacers coach Bob Hill said after Wednesday's 110-107 loss. "He just keeps coming and coming, like Joe Frazier did against Ali."

Nobody has found a way to stop the 6-foot-8, 230-pound, 34-year-old Rodman since last season. He may not top Will Chamberlain's single game record of 55 set in 32 years ago, but he's got Will beat in another category: percentage of his team's rebounds.

"I can't take all of the credit for this season," Rodman said. "I credit the team, especially Bill Laimbeer. He's helped me a lot in the last couple years to become a better rebounder."

"And when he's on the court, he does such a good job of boxing out that all I have to do is go get the ball."

Stanford swimmer shines in backstroke at U.S. trials

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Jeff Rouse swam the second-fastest 100-meter backstroke in history today, and the fastest ever in the United States at the U.S. swimming trials.

Rouse qualified for tonight's finals with a time of 54.13 seconds, just two-tenths of a second shy of the world record of 53.93 set last summer in the Pan Pacific Games. She earned an Olympic team berth with a surprising runner-up finish to Anita Nall in the women's 100-meter breaststroke.

"I had the swim of my life and it came at the right time," Kline said. "I didn't expect to (make the team). I'm overwhelmed."

Janet Evans tries to qualify for her second individual event tonight in

the 800 freestyle, where she owns the world record and was gold medalist in the 1988 Olympics.

Man Biondi and Tom Jager renew their nine-year rivalry in the 50 freestyle preliminaries, while Melvin Stewart attempts to qualify in the 200 butterfly. He holds the world and American records in the event.

Biondi was the fastest qualifier today at 22:27, followed by Jager at 22:29. Jager holds the world record at 21:41.

Stewart was the top qualifier for tonight's 200 butterfly finals at 1:57.99, well off his world record pace of 1:56.69. However, he was the only swimmer to break two minutes. His closest competitor was David Wharton at 2:00.01.

In the women's 100 breaststroke Wednesday night, Nall won in 1:09.29, the second fastest time ever by an American. She was third at the halfway point, then overhauled American record holder Tracy McEwen in the final stretch.

Kline, a 17-year-old from Lexington, Ky., finished sixth in the Wednesday morning preliminaries. At night, she was fifth after 50 meters in lane 7, where she couldn't see her competitor.

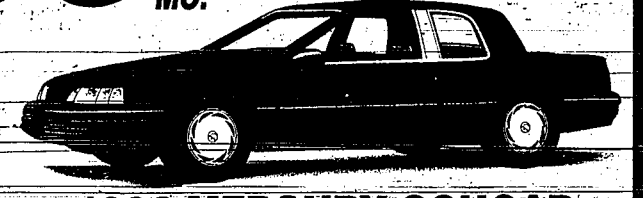
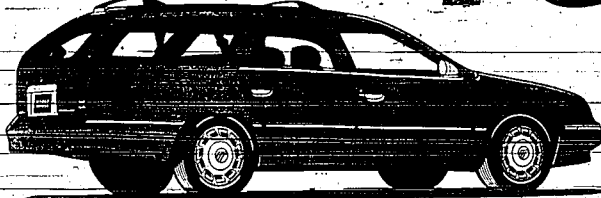

John Forsythe: 'I'd been laughed at for 9 years; why not get paid for it?'

Dysfunctional families just in case you haven't noticed, are becoming the rage on TV. First there were the bickering Bundys of "Married... With Children," then Roseanne... then "The Simpsons," and then the eccentric "Torkelsons."

Now comes William Powers, a philandering U.S. senator with a domineering wife, an anorexic daughter, a suicidal son-in-law, a worry-wart press secretary, a ruthlessly ambitious administrative assistant, a grandson who is used as an election prop and a suffering maid who is abused by the senator's dragon-lady spouse.

Toss in an illegitimate daughter who shows up on his doorstep on the eve of his bid for re-election, and you've got the setting for "The

Powers That Be," a political satire from Norman Lear, just in time for election year.

Starring as Senator Powers in the new Saturday-night NBC series is John Forsythe of "Dynasty" fame. As a comedic actor, he is stiffer than the Tin Man after a good rain, yet it seems to fit the character he plays. Besides, it's hard not to like a self-deprecating actor who jokes about his on-screen persona.

Getting back into the comedy arena is a big switch from Joan Collins," Forsythe told critics at a press conference to launch the series. "I figured I'd been laughed at for nine years; why not get paid for it?" Co-starring as Powers' haughty, insensitive wife, Margaret, is stage and small-screen veteran Holland Taylor. She gets some great lines in "The Powers That Be," most of which involve the bossing around of her maid, Charlotte (Elizabeth

Berridge). When Charlotte fixes a fully-dressed turkey for a press reception, Margaret fumes. "Why would I serve a whole roast turkey to people who would gladly eat a sock on white bread if it were free? Take it away."

Margaret also carps at poor Charlotte for such heinous crimes as lint balls on towels and even slaps her.

Some scribes at the NBC press conference took exception to the slap, claiming it was typical of the show's cruel humor. A few critics in the room also seemed to suggest that the show made fun of paraplegics, because in one scene, the senator seeks an endorsement from a former football star who is now in a wheelchair. The former football hero is considered an asset to the senator's campaign because he possesses the ingredients most valued in a supporter — he is handsome, famous and disabled.

"We don't suggest that people run around slapping their maids," said an exasperated Lear, who actually had to explain that the characters are broadly drawn to show how some people will use others for gain.

After a decade of insufferably wholesome TV sitcom families, "The Powers That Be" doesn't deserve scorn; it deserves a medal. Here is a group of insensitive people concerned primarily with saving their political skins and using others to do it. At last, some reality on TV.

"I think there is an overabundance of sympathetic people on television," says Lear. "There are enough kind, sweet, wonderful families, enough dutiful children and enough dutiful wives and wonderful relationships."

'In Sickness and in Health' an inspirational look at MS

Lesley Ann Warren tackles a difficult role this week, playing a woman with progressive multiple sclerosis who makes an almost saintly decision to enter a residential facility in order to give her devoted husband and daughter their freedom.

"In Sickness and in Health" co-stars Tom Skerritt as Anita Mattison's husband, Jarrett, and Robin Lively as Holly, whose lives have been circumscribed by her illness. Emmy-winner Marg Helgenberger ("China Beach") plays Mickey, a widow who helps care for wheelchair-bound Anita. With her two small children, Mickey brings life back into the Mattison family and wins Anita's friendship.

But, her vitality underscores the

fact that Anita's disability is sap- ping them all.

"In Sickness and in Health" could be interpreted as the latest disease-of-the-week movie. But Warren doesn't see it that way. "I don't think it's a movie so much about the disease as it is about relationships," she said.

"When I read it, what I was most struck with is that it's really a love story in my eyes, a very real one: what can happen in a relationship where no one is, in fact, a villain. I'm hoping that people would realize that no one had selfish motives here, no one. To me, it's sort of an inspirational story about people who struggle with real-life issues. There are no clear endings, no clear solutions."

The show airs at 8 p.m. MST Sunday night on KMVT, Channel 11, Cable 12, and other CBS affiliates.

Channel chatter

Lavin returns. Out of sitcom circulation since "Alice" ended a successful nine-year run in 1985, Emmy-winner Linda Lavin returns to prime time Tuesday, March 24 in the new spring comedy series, "Room for Two." Lavin plays a recently widowed Ohio woman who winds up sharing a Manhattan apartment with her grown daughter (Patricia Heaton), a TV talk show producer. "Room for Two" moves into plush surroundings for its two-month test run, taking over the 9:30 ET Tuesday time slot occupied by "Coach." Not to worry, "Coach" fans. Hayden Fox & Co. will return from their well-deserved hiatus in time for the May ratings sweeps with brand-new episodes. "Coach" ranked sixth among 120 network series seen so far this season.

Summertime showdown. NBC's new prime-time news magazine, with Jane Pauley and Stone Phillips, finally has a name — "Dateline NBC." Reporters Arthur Kent and Deborah Roberts will join the staff of the network's upcoming news magazine show. "Dateline NBC," Kent will be based in Rome, contributing international segments. Roberts, an Atlanta-based NBC reporter, will relocate to New York. It launches March 31. Meanwhile, ABC News has announced the launch of a new newsmagazine at 7 p.m. ET Sundays this summer, opposite that 5,000-pound TV gorilla known as "60 Minutes." Tom Yellin, who helped coordinate ABC's Persian Gulf War coverage from Saudi Arabia and is executive producer of the "Peter Jennings Reporting" specials, has been named e.p. of the still-unfilled hour-long broadcast. No anchors yet, either, but front-runners are said to be anchor-correspondent Forrest Sawyer and Sheila McVicar, a London-based correspondent for ABC World News Tonight. McVicar, who joined ABC in 1990 from the Canadian Broadcasting Corp., earned high marks for her Gulf War reporting. ABC sources say that Sam Donaldson, said to be unhappy in Diane Sawyer's shadow on "PrimeTime Live," is a long shot for an anchor slot on the new show.

Novelist Judith Krantz and her producer hubby, Steve, have signed a long-range agreement with ABC Entertainment for five projects, including the miniseries version of "Scrapies Two." The novel is due this summer; the miniseries in late 1993. Krantz will also deliver two original movies based on Krantz stories and two "event series" of six or eight hours' length. These last are billed as "multiple stories authored by Ms. Krantz and televised on a weekly basis until the novel is complete, not on consecutive nights, as miniseries are traditionally aired." For Krantz, the involvement with ABC will complete a hat trick. Previous novels have aired as miniseries on NBC and CBS.

WHAT'S NEW? Jamie Gangel, a Washington-based correspondent for NBC News since joining the network in 1983, has been named national correspondent for the "Today" show. She replaces Rick Davis. Former Notre Dame coach Digger Phelps has been named an analyst for CBS's coverage of the NCAA men's basketball tournament, which starts March 19.

Tom Bradford has been named exec producer of the new CBS News overnight broadcast to debut next month. Bradford has been CBS's director of recruitment and night news manager since June.

ABC News pulls in 4 1st place nods

ABC News took first place in four of seven broadcast news categories in the Washington Journalism Review's eighth annual "Best in the Business" reader poll. It was announced Monday.

Winners in the 13 print and broadcast journalism categories will be honored Tuesday at the National Press Club.

For the fourth straight time Peter Jennings won "best evening news anchor." Brit Hume "was a commanding choice" over CBS's Susan Spencer and NBC's John Cochran as "best White House correspondent."

In addition, Joff Greenfield was named "best critic of the news media," and "Nightline" was voted "best TV news interview-discussion program."

Other broadcast winners included Katherine Courie of NBC's "Today" as "best morning TV news anchor-host," Peter Arnett of Cable News Network as "best foreign correspondent" and Charles Osgood, CBS, "best radio reporter."

Some 1,200 WJR readers responded this year, the second highest response since the poll began in 1985. Winners were chosen from nominations made by a national board of journalists selected by the magazine's staff.

Readers this year were also asked two "personal opinion" questions related to journalism. Asked to select the principal mass news medium in this country during the first half of the next century, 74 percent chose cable TV, 18 percent network TV, 15 percent newspapers and 12 percent home computer systems.

That's what cable's Discovery Channel has offered to seven presidential candidates.

From 7 to 10 p.m. on March 8 — two days before Super Tuesday — each major candidate will have 20 minutes to present his "vision of America" and how he plans to achieve it.

Invites were sent to Republican rivals President Bush and Patrick Buchanan and Democrats Jerry Brown, Bill Clinton, Tom Harkin, Bob Kerrey and Paul Tsongas. As of last Friday, Brown and Harkin had accepted, says a Discovery spokesman.

Former CBS News anchor Walter Cronkite is slated to produce and host "The Presidential Candidates: Address to the Nation," pending approval from CBS. (He's still under contract as a consultant.) It's "99 percent" certain that Uncle Walter will be there, says the spokesman.

A.C. Nielsen has announced that starting in November, meter-ratings service will be added in three cities — San Diego, Baltimore, and Kansas City — which means the Nielsen overnight ratings will reflect results in 28 cities, instead of the current 25!!!

'21 Jump Street' sinks into syndication

Q: What happened to "21 Jump Street"? — A.M.

A: "21 Jump Street" is no longer in production after 102 hourlong episodes (plus a two-hour pilot), the last 22 filmed in first-run syndication after four seasons on the Fox network.

Q: In what state is Fred Grandy (Copper on "The Love Boat") a congressman? — M.A.

A: Grandy has been the Republican congressman from the 6th district in Iowa since 1987. He is a member of the House Ways and Means Committee, as well as the Standards-of-Official-Conduct Committee.

The last time he ran for office (1990), he beat his Democratic opponent by a better-than-2-to-1 ratio.

Grandy, best known in his acting days for his role on "The Love Boat," also appeared for one season as a regular on "Maude" (1973-74) and in the films "Blind Ambition," "Close Encounters of the Third Kind," "Death Rate 2000" and "The Gift, Most Likely To."

Q: I understand Sharon Gless will be working with Robert Wagner, with whom she starred in the TV series, "Switch," back in the '70s. Will they be doing another series together? — A.S.

A: Gless and Wagner recently worked together when Wagner appeared on three episodes of "The Trials of Rosie O'Neill." However, the show was pulled from the CBS lineup before those episodes aired and its future is questionable.

Q: How long has "Married ... With Children" been on the air? — E.Z.

A: The popular Fox series premiered in April, 1987. And to the reader in Highland Park who inquired about the show's theme song, "Love and Marriage": It is Frank Sinatra's classic 1955 recording of the Sammy Cahn/Jimmy Van Heusen tune.

Q: Since Goldie Hawn keeps telling us about the joys of family life, can you tell me if she's actually married right now? — M.R.

A: No, she's not. For the last eight years, Goldie, 46, has been living the good life with actor Kurt Russell. The household includes three children — Oliver and Kate from Goldie's second marriage in 1976 to musician Bill Hudson, and Wyatt, her son by Russell. The family has a large home in Los Angeles, and another on a 70-acre ranch outside Aspen, Colo. Goldie and Kurt remain very much in love, and very much unmarried.

BIG-BAND BLOOPER: In the new movie, "Shining Through," with Michael Douglas and Melanie Griffith, there is a scene where the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor is announced.

'Murphy Brown' Senate hearing hit home

Murphy Brown got the story exactly right. She hit the dart board of discontent with the U.S. Senate dead center last week in an episode of the situation comedy that left nobody laughing.

That was the point. Witch hunts aren't funny. The entertainment industry, which felt the lash of McCarthyism with such force that it is still stinging, stood up this week to spit in the face of abuse of power by the Senate and the resulting attack on the First Amendment to the Constitution.

The writers for the fictional television reporter made art imitate life with such accuracy that a medium we expect to bring us topical laughs brought chilling constitutional questions into American living rooms. The crew from "FYI" wasn't playing this story for the jokes — although they were there at just the right places. The program, instead, made the often-obtusely argued issue of press freedom accessible to a mass audience. The timing was perfect.

On the day Nina Totenberg, National Public Radio reporter, was hauled before a Senate special counsel investigating the leak of Anita Hill's testimony in the Clarence Thomas confirmation process, Brown carried a message to prime time. Murphy Brown, seeming much more real than fictional, pleaded the case against intimidating reporters when

she was hauled before a familiar appearing Senate committee after reporting on senatorial misconduct.

Just like the cases of Totenberg and Newsday reporter Timothy Phelps, who also broke the Hill story on Oct. 6, the object of Senate pursuit of Brown was finding the source of information leaks to reporters. Not truth. Not an examination of Senate conduct or shortcomings in procedure.

No introspection, please. Just find a reporter and burn her or him at the stake for watching what's happening and telling — even when the boys are bad. A witch hunts diverts attention from the original incident that put the Senate or some of its members up to public scrutiny for misjudgments that range from simple bungling to theft.

Totenberg and Phelps have both appeared before special counsel Peter Fleming, a New York lawyer hired by the Senate. Fleming's assignment is to find who snitched that the Senate Judiciary Committee during the Thomas confirmation process, learned of Hill's accusation that Thomas had sexually harassed her.

A story that needed to be told? You betcha. Prove to me that the committee, mortified by the disclosure only a wink and a nod before the end of the confirmation process, would not have said a word in public about Hill's charges unless they had been broadcast and published.

Totenberg, in an interview with CBS News, condensed the absurdity of this post-Hill damage control effort. She pointed out that leaks of information are the way business is done in Washington and it is the reporter's job to make sure leaked information is accurate and that it is a legitimate story.

"The Senate is investigating the very democratic system under which we operate," Totenberg said.

Maybe that wasn't the intent of the Senate. But that's where things have arrived with the special counsel's inquiry. He could now recommend to the Senate Rules Committee that it subpoena Phelps and Totenberg and subpoena them to know who told.

Why can't these guys just let it be? They fouled up, got caught and tried to straighten things out too late. People foul up — even U.S. senators. Maybe they would foul up less often if they concentrated on public business instead of leak plumbing.

The best lines in Monday night's fictional story blew away the smoke. Jim Dial, the old shoe of an anchorman and resident stuffed shirt in the "FYI" gang, sized up the Senate's attitude this way:

"Our inner cities lie in ruins, our middle class is adrift and disillusioned, and there they sit. Those little wienies, playing their little wienie games."

Valley's KIPT reception improves

Magic Valley residents in communities north of Twin Falls are receiving a much stronger signal from Idaho Public Television from a new television transmitter, KIPT-TV, Channel 13, which went on the air in late January from Flat Top Butte.

Station manager Lynn Allen, KAID-4, Boise, explained that a direct microwave feed from Boise to the KIPT transmitter brings the full KAID/Idaho Public Television programming schedule to viewers in the Magic Valley area.

Translators serving the more remote communities around the

valley will have access to a much stronger "source" signal from the new KIPT transmitter, which should greatly improve Idaho Public Television reception for those areas.

"Whether you watch public TV on Channel 13, on cable Channel 4 or from a translator, you will see a big improvement because the microwave feed to KIPT-13 brings a much stronger and cleaner source signal to the Magic Valley," Allen said.

The Channel 13 transmitter broadcasts at 22,400 watts effective radiated power, nearly 10 times the former broadcast power.

The former signal was directed

southwest from Flat Top Butte. Now, the signal is radiated equally well in all directions, making a great difference in reception to the north of Flat Top Butte.

"Tune in Channel 13... you will like our new look," Allen said.

"We're pleased to be providing this improved service to the people of Magic Valley."
