Schools spend thousands trying to alter fund formula

BOISE — A judge on Thursday ruled against dozens of Idaho school districts that spent more than \$400,000 trying to prove the state's education funding scheme is unconstitutional.

Fourth District Judge Gerald Schroeder Thursday afternoon dismissed two lawsuits challenging Idaho's public-school funding system. Schroeder said the Idaho Supreme Court decided the issue in 1975.

Jerome, Minidoka, Twin Falls, Buhl and Dietrich are among the schools suing the state.

The Supreme Court was aware 17 years ago of the practical and constitutional swamp it was invited to enter, Schroeder said in a 75-page ruling. "It declined the invitation."

"The state's funding system hasn't changed much, Schroeder said, and as long as the Legislature follows that system the courts can't do much.

"The education budget does not exist in a vacuum," Schroeder said. "There are many legitimate needs to be met, and the Legislature is in the unique position to balance those needs."

Any other system would be unmanageable, he said.

"Were the court to enter this area it would appear it must retain jurisdiction ...

and grade the Legislature each year on its performance — perhaps even tell the governor he must sign or veto a legislative funding measure if it either meets or falls short of the standard," Schroeder said.

The various government agencies spent a total of \$538,581 on the lawsuits. Jerome spent \$10,795; Minidoka spent \$19,350; Twin Falls spent \$26,332 and Buhl spent \$5,625.

That's more than the Twin Falls schools wanted to spend, district Superintendent Terrell Donich said Thursday.

"When you lose in a legal case, you wonder if it's worth it," he said.

House opens bad check identity list

WASHINGTON — Democratic leaders caved in to Republicans crying cover-up and convinced the House Thursday night to vote to identify 355 current and former lawmakers who wrote bad checks at the members' bank.

Some offenders rushed to confess in advance.

Adding to the drama, House Sergeant at Arms Jack Russ abruptly resigned without giving a reason. He had been in charge of the bank's operations and came under severe criticism for the overdraft problem.

At a date of backstage negotiations, the House voted 381-36 for public disclosure of the 24 worst offenders. A later vote was scheduled on a resolution to release names of all other rubber check writers. It was expected to receive approval of the House.

The list of 24 abusers — 19 current House members and five former members — will be officially released within 10 days. The fuller list will be released 10 days later. The bank itself was closed late last year, after the furor erupted.

Russ' sudden resignation came moments before debate opened on disclosure of the names. He had been sharply criticized by the House ethics committee, which investigated the bank scandal, for misusing his position by "cashing checks with insufficient funds to cover them" and for poorly managing the bank.

Following the resignation, Speaker Thomas S. Foley appointed one of his top aides, William Brandenstein, sergeant at arms, the officer in charge of security for House members.

The ethics committee investigation found that between July 1988 and August 1989, Russ presented 19 bad checks at the bank with an aggregate face value of \$56,100.

Before the vote, lawmakers offered several explanations for taking advantage of a system that let them overdraw their accounts for years on end without interest or penalty.

Among them was Rep. Charles Hatcher, D-Texas, who said he overdraw his account as many as 780 times over 39 months.

TWIN FALLS — When a kid has twin four-year-old sisters, he can't get enough protection for his "stuff."

That's why Sawtooth Elementary School third-grader Mark Fuller — whose sisters, Niki and Joanna, are constantly after his money and his tapes — invented the "Stuff Protector."

Mark's Styrofoam safety box with alarm produces an annoying beeping sound when an intruding hand pokes a marble into a twisted paper clip attached to ultra-sensitive Go-Bot-guts.

He has convinced his sisters that the alarm is hooked up to the police station. It works, he says.

Mark entered his contraption — held together with duct and Scotch tape — in the Twin Falls School District-sponsored Invention Convention on Thursday.

"No more worry about who is touching your stuff," Mark's cardboard instructions read.

He was one of about 200 kindergartners to ninth-graders who entered the contest of aspiring Thomas Edisons. Prizes include savings bonds and scholarships and winners could enter the U.S. Patent Foundation state-wide "National Invent America" competitions.

"We give out lots and lots of prizes," said Connie Pepper, who coordinates the convention and the district's gifted and talented program.

The exercise of finding practical solutions — inventions — to everyday household problems, develops creativity, she said.

Berline Elementary fourth-grader Meghan Petterson knows all about practicality.

She invented "The Paper Chase," an eight-roll toilet paper-holder that

Comply, U.N. tells appellant Iraq

UNITED NATIONS — The Security Council stood firm Thursday in its demand that Iraq comply completely and immediately with the Gulf War cease-fire provisions, rebuffing an appeal for leniency from Saddam Hussein's special envoy.

"In the view of the Security Council, the government of Iraq has not yet complied fully and unconditionally with those obligations," the council said in a statement read by its president, Venezuelan Ambassador Diego Arias.

Iraq had promised the United Nations a complete accounting of its most dangerous weapons and pledged to tie up other loose ends from the Gulf War, but the U.S. ambassador said Baghdad was offering only "mirrors and smoke."

The response of the 15-member Security Council reflected Thomas Pickering's skepticism. The United States, a permanent member of the council, pushed for its authorization of military force to drive Iraq from Kuwait last year. The council has not ruled out a military response to enforce the cease-fire terms.

For two days, Tariq Aziz, Iraq's deputy prime minister, appeared before the council

to argue unsuccessfully that Iraq was cooperating and that the council should lift crippling trade sanctions.

Aziz, speaking forcefully in Arabic for an hour, responded point-by-point to council charges that Iraq is violating U.N. resolutions passed after its Aug. 2, 1990, invasion of Kuwait and the allied rout of Iraqi forces.

The 54-year-old Iraqi envoy said his country was ready to make "a full, complete and comprehensive declaration and disclosure of all programs having to do with (cease-fire) resolution 687." But he said this disclosure should not violate Iraq's rights.

"We are not bargaining over our sovereignty. We are not bargaining over our rights to live as a free, independent people," Aziz told the council.

U.N. inspectors believe Iraq is still hiding weapons such as Scud missiles and could use them to strike neighboring countries.

Hans Blix, director-general of the International Atomic Energy Agency, told reporters Iraq was hiding nuclear components, and Rolf Ekewitz, head of the U.N. commission overseeing elimination of Iraq's mass destruction weapons, said he saw no change in Baghdad's position.

Aziz repeated Iraq's claim that it has already destroyed all weapons banned under cease-fire terms — such as ballistic missiles and chemical warheads.

But he balked at demands to destroy missile-building and repair equipment. He argued that such equipment could be converted to civilian use. U.N. inspectors oppose this, saying Iraq could clandestinely then switch the equipment back again.

Senate refuses to scrap Demo income tax cut

WASHINGTON — The Senate rejected a bipartisan attempt Thursday to scrap a Democratic tax cut and instead use a tax increase on the rich to reduce the \$1-billion-a-day budget deficit.

The \$300-per-child tax cut "might slightly ease the economic squeeze their parents are experiencing but it will do little to expand opportunities for the children themselves to participate in an expanding economy," said Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich.

"The first step toward boosting the economy, Levin said, is to reduce the deficit. His amendment, rejected 57-39, would have used three-quarters of the revenue from a tax increase on the wealthy to cut the deficit and the remainder to improve roads, airports and job training.

"The deficit is a problem but it's not the only problem," countered Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas and the chief author of the tax cut. Using the tax-increase money for deficit reduction "bypasses our concern for middle-income Americans and their children," he said.

Working into the night, the Senate adopted by five-vote margin an amendment by Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., to require penalty-free Individual Retirement Account withdrawals of up to \$10,000 this year to buy a new car. He cited estimates that could prompt up to 6.5 million people to buy new cars.

Also adopted was an amendment by Sen. Howard M. Metzenbaum, D-Ohio, to deny tax deductions for savings and loan takeovers that have been subsidized by federal regulators.

The National Weather Service says spring-like weather continues over Idaho.

As a ridge of high pressure dominates the Pacific Northwest, this ridge will drift eastward during the next 24 hours but near record high temperatures are expected through today. By Saturday, a cooling trend will begin moving into Idaho along with a chance of showers.

Sunny skies covered the state again on Thursday. Winds were mostly light and the temperatures much above normal in the afternoon with readings in the 60s and low 70s across the southern sections of the state.

There were no reports of precipitation from any station.

The warmest temperature in the state Thursday was 74 degrees at Hagerman. Stanley reported the coldest at 12 degrees.

Elsewhere in the nation Thursday, the highest temperature was 85 degrees at Palm Springs, Calif. The lowest was 26 at Rochester, Minn., and Park Falls, Wis.

Ice jams, snow, gales persist across Northeast

Heavy snow, coastal gales and a few ice jams persisted across the Northeast for a second day Thursday, while strong gusts and bitter cold combined for subzero wind-chills over the Great Lakes.

Light snowfalls also were scattered from Missouri to Tennessee and Kentucky. A few rain showers damped parts of central Florida and the lower Rio Grande Valley in Texas. The rest of the nation had mostly mild weather.

Snow fell at a rate of 3 inches per hour during the morning around Fulton, N.Y., east of Lake Ontario. Sustained winds to 35 mph made driving hazardous. Up to 3 feet of snow fell in parts of western New York.

Ice jams continued to cause some flooding along at least four rivers in Vermont. The Winooski deluged Montpelier on Wednesday. Maine and New York state also suffered some ice-caused flooding Tuesday.

Temperatures were below freezing at midday from the eastern Dakotas and Nebraska to the central Appalachians and the northern Atlantic coast. The Rockies were chilly also.

Tsongas targets Clinton 'baggage' as Demo hopefuls woo labor vote

DETROIT (AP) - Paul Tsongas, courting the union vote in a layoff-battered auto parts factory, blamed Thursday's labor leaders are worried about whether Bill Clinton could win the November "end game" against George Bush.

Clinton said he saw political desperation in Tsongas' assaults on his character and in a new Tsongas ad that attacks his economic message.

That happens all the time when people lose political debates. They resort to personal attacks on their opponents," the Arkansas governor said as he campaigned at a Chicago bakery.

"I know what my character is. I've been called everything but a blue goose and the voters keep voting for me," he added.

Both candidates doubted the Hispanic and African American campaign stops in advance of Tuesday's presidential primaries in the two industrial states. The third Democrat in the race, former California Gov. Jerry Brown, concentrated his efforts on Michigan.

Tsongas, campaigning at a Detroit plant, said he had talked to labor leaders who are concerned about Clinton's record game here is defeating George Bush.

"The concern they expressed to me was 'baggage, sort of our equivalent to Federal Express. You carry all this baggage around, eventually you're going to be vulnerable,'" the former Massachusetts senator said, declaring himself the strongest Democrat to run against President Bush.

Tsongas said Clinton's business dealings with the owner of a failed

S&L while he was governor as one example.

"It seems to me that what Bill Clinton ought to be doing is explaining to the American people how he regulates an individual and has a business relationship with them at the same time. That's part of the baggage we talk about," Tsongas said.

Clinton defends the deal, saying his partner did not get into the S&L business until years into the real estate venture. He said Tsongas had explaining of his own to do on S&L, since the industry wrote him a letter in 1983 thanking him for his work on thrift deregulation.

Tsongas said Thursday there was nothing wrong with the legislation; the problem was how the Reagan administration regulated S&L.

The district would have had a \$500,000-\$600,000 increase in its funding from state coffers, Donich said.

"There is a point where you can't sink a lot of money because you don't have a lot of money," he said.

Donich said an appeal is possible but all the districts that filed the lawsuit will have to get together to decide.

"We really do feel the funding system is inequitable to the point of being unconstitutional," he said.

A total of 48 school districts, parents and students in various school districts filed two separate lawsuits, which were combined for court proceedings. The Idaho Education Association and the Blaine County School District joined in.

One lawsuit asked for a ruling that the present elementary and secondary public school financing system is unconstitutional. It argued that the system places heavy reliance on property taxes, with the result that there's a great disparity in the amount of money available to

the districts depending on how high property values are in the district.

The second lawsuit claimed that the overall level of financing is inadequate to meet the goal of a public school system that is "uniform and thorough."

Blaine County, the state's richest district in terms of property values, argued that the funding formula results in little state support in its district.

The school districts, which are local government units, sued Gov. Cecil Andrus, the Idaho Legislature, and the Idaho Board of Education and the Idaho Department of Education, all state-level agencies.

Buhl has withdrawn from the lawsuits, which have been an expensive proposition.

"According to a letter from Deputy Attorney General William A. von Tagen to Senate Education Committee Chairman John Hansen, R-Idaho Falls, the school districts that filed the lawsuit spent \$430,530 through Dec. 31. Attorney General's expense totaled \$70,400," said von Tagen, who defended the state-level agencies.

\$100 debt leads to fatal shooting

ELKO, Nev. (AP) - One man is dead and another is in critical condition following an attempted murdersuicide Thursday at an Elko drilling company, Elko County Sheriff Neil Harris said.

Harris said Fred Edgar Beresia, 27, was in critical condition after undergoing surgery at Elko General Hospital for two or three gunshot wounds.

Harris said Robert L. Rogers, 53, who shot Beresia, then turned the shotgun on himself and was pronounced dead at the scene.

Witnesses said the two men had a longstanding dispute over a \$100 debt.

Compound from soil stops AIDS skin cancer in laboratory mice

WASHINGTON (AP) — A compound from soil bacteria has stopped the growth in laboratory mice of Kaposi's sarcoma, a lethal skin cancer common among male AIDS patients.

Researchers at the National Cancer Institute report in Friday's issue of the journal Science that a compound called sulfated polysaccharide peptidoglycan, or SP-PG, is more effective in laboratory studies against Kaposi's sarcoma than commonly used drugs.

Shuji Nakamura, University of

Southern California scientist formerly with NCI and first author of the study, said that SP-PG was tested both against laboratory cultures of Kaposi's sarcoma or KS, and against lesions of the cancer that had been grown in laboratory mice that lack an immune system.

In both cases, said Nakamura, KS was stopped in its tracks.

"SP-PG specifically inhibited the growth of Kaposi's sarcoma cells in nude mice," Nakamura said in an interview. "And during our experiment on mice, I did

not see any type of side effect."

This is in contrast to other KS drugs that often have toxic side effects on humans.

Nakamura said the effectiveness of SP-PG in controlling KS was then tested against three drugs, suramin, pentosan polysulfate and interferon alpha, all now commonly used to treat KS. "SP-PG is much, much better," the researcher said.

Human clinical trials of SP-PG are being organized, but Nakamura said he didn't know when they would start.

The SP-PG compound was earlier isolated from soil by Daiichi Pharmaceutical Co. of Tokyo and found to naturally suppress the growth of blood vessels.

This finding prompted NCI scientists to test the drug against KS because the cancer feeds itself by wild and rapid growth of blood vessels. The disease also causes painful swelling of surrounding tissue. Nakamura said SP-PG appears to stop both processes.

The experiment, conducted in the NCI lab of Robert C. Gallo, leaned

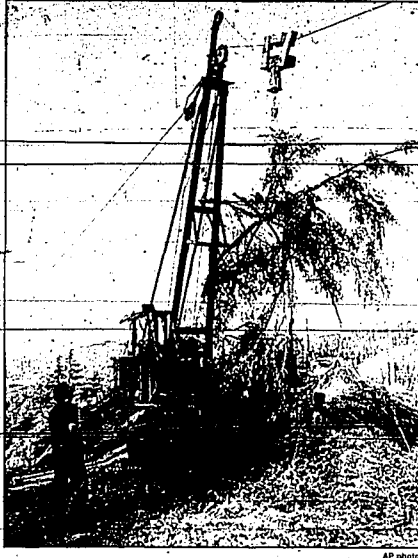
heavily on earlier studies of a natural protein, called oncostatin M, that is produced by the immune system. Research by Gallo's group, also reported in Science, showed that although oncostatin M can suppress other types of cancer, the substance actually doubles the growth of AIDS-related KS.

An independent study led by Steven Miles of UCLA, also published in Science, showed that KS in the absence of oncostatin M grew poorly and did not survive in laboratory cultures. But oncostatin M, added to the KS cells proved to be a powerful stimulant, allowing KS to thrive, Miles reports.

Miles said in Science that a compound that blocked the effect of oncostatin M possibly could work as a drug against KS.

Until the AIDS epidemic started, KS was considered a rare skin cancer in old men of Mediterranean heritage. The sudden appearance 10 years ago of many cases of KS among young men with depressed immune systems was one of the early clues that there was a new and deadly disease moving through the population.

The virus that causes AIDS, of acquired immune deficiency syndrome, apparently creates the ideal biological conditions for Kaposi's sarcoma.

Pressure to harvest yew trees increases

SWEET HOME, Ore. (AP) — Hidden in the thick trees covering a steep slope, logger Doug Whitney gave two short blasts on his horn, signaling that another load was ready to be hoisted up the hill.

Instead of a big log crashing onto the loading site, the cable brought up a clump of branches from a Pacific yew tree. The scraggly weed of a tree has become the biggest little tree in the Northwest since scientists discovered its bark contains a chemical called taxol, which fights cancer.

Loggers have always been busy with cutting things, but now they are busy with saving things. We're probably saving lives in the long run," Jerry Hammitt said over the roof of a chain saw.

"As a logger, we furnished material for homes. Now, we're furnishing bark to help humanity," said logger Tom Savage. Taxol has been used to treat the mother of the man his daughter plans to marry.

While the race is on to find a way to produce commercial quantities of taxol in a test tube, it will have to come out of the woods of Oregon, Washington and Idaho for the next three to five years.

That means work for loggers, who can make \$150 a day peeling 125 pounds of bark, comparable to what

they demand cutting trees. But their bark is overstrip supply.

"Pacific yews don't get very big. And they thrive in the shade of the same, dwindling old-growth forests where the threatened northern spotted owl lives. Lawsuits to protect owl habitat have brought logging to a virtual halt on national forests in the Northwest.

And as the logging goes, so goes the yew harvest.

Salvage sales, such as the one where Hammitt's crew worked among timber blow-down in a storm, are still available, but little else.

"The level of logging depends on the progress of lawsuits and consultations with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which decides whether timber should be saved for owl habitat. It is going to be more difficult to meet the target" of 750,000 pounds of yew bark this year, said Bob Devlin, the agency's regional director of timber management.

In congressional testimony last week, Dr. Bruce Chabner, director of the cancer-treatment division of the National Cancer Institute, said 6,000 people would get taxol from last year's harvest of 825,000 pounds.

New Russian envoy seeks help, not charity

WASHINGTON (AP) — Russia's new ambassador said Thursday that American aid is crucial to his country's struggle for democracy but "we are here not to ask some spoon of porridge to be put in our mouth."

Vladimir Lukin told a news conference the day after he presented his credentials to President Bush that "we ask you to promote our smooth entrance into the world democratic community."

Lukin said Russian President Boris Yeltsin told him to tell Bush that Yeltsin wants to reduce strategic missiles "without lengthy negotiations."

Secretary of State James A. Baker III and Russian Foreign Minister Andrei Kozyrev discussed arms reductions Wednesday in Brussels, but were unable to report any progress after meeting more than four hours.

Lukin, in an apparent reference to U.S. political opposition to foreign aid during a recession, said: "We understand quite well we should not ask for some money, some material — though we need some," he said.

When asked to specify how much assistance to the country, he said, Lukin said "it would be a little bit strange if I didn't say the more the better."

Bush administration for being slow to react to Russian needs came from Capitol Hill at the same time Lukin was speaking.

Journalist who fought terrorists gunned down

NEW YORK (AP) — A journalist assassinated at point-blank range in a restaurant had investigated Colombian drug cartels, terrorists and corrupt officials.

The question facing police now is who would have him dead the most.

"It's open for speculation," said Chief of Detectives Joseph Borrelli.

"You can put any motive in it you want at this point."

Manuel De Dios Unanue, former editor-in-chief of the city's largest Spanish-language newspaper, El Diario-La Prensa, had battled drug traffickers through his columns, reporting and a book.

"There could be another motive, but the obvious one is retribution of some sort for his activities against the drug dealers," Borrelli added.

A former co-worker says De Dios was killed because he published the name of the Medellín drug cartel's new money laundering queen in the first issue of his new magazine, Grimen, a Spanish-language crime periodical.

De Dios, 48, was killed

Wednesday night inside a popular neighborhood restaurant he was known to frequent in a Latin section of Queens.

A map entered the restaurant, looked around and left. A short time later, the same man, wearing a hood, "walked right up to Mr. de Dios and shot him," Borrelli said.

De Dios, seated at the bar about 6 feet from the door, was shot twice in the head with a 9mm semi-automatic pistol.

Detectives believe a second man acted as a backup and stood by the door, the chief said. Both men fled on foot.

The restaurant patrons said "the suspect in the shooting, was a complete stranger, they hadn't seen him in the neighborhood before," according to Borrelli.

FCC OKs relaxing radio restrictions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Communications Commission, seeking to bolster the ailing radio industry, voted Thursday to let financially successful broadcast owners buy more radio stations.

The FCC will now allow one company to own 30 AM and 30 FM stations nationwide, instead of 12 AM and 12 FM stations, with only one of each in a single community.

A company will be able to buy from three to six stations in a single market, depending on the size of the community.

Commissioner Andrew Barrett abstained from the 4-0 vote, saying the action seemed "based more on wishful thinking and personal goals."

Judge delays hearing

PONTIAC, Mich. (AP) — Suicide machine inventor Dr. Jack Kevorkian on Thursday likened his timed legal battles to a desire by prosecutors for "humans to keep uttering."

Kevorkian made his first court appearance before Oakland County Circuit Judge David Breck, who will preside at the pathologist's murder trial. Breck gave both sides six weeks to respond to procedural motions.

Conservative backs return of Aristide

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — A conservative leader on Thursday endorsed a plan envisioning the return of ousted President Jean-Bertrand Aristide, and the Senate president said parliament would vote on the proposal Monday.

The plan, which was worked out last month with mediation by the Organization of American States, provides for lifting a punishing 6000 trade embargo as soon as a new Aristide-approved government is installed.

The agreement was signed by leaders of both houses of parliament, as well as Aristide, who was overthrown by the military on Sept. 30. Leading lawmakers and business leaders say the plan must quickly be approved to end the embargo on the hemisphere's poorest nation.

ANC warns against township violence

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — As the deaths mounted, the African National Congress warned Thursday that violence in black townships could cause whites to reject political reforms.

At risk, the ANC says, is a whites-only poll scheduled Tuesday that asks voters if they support or reject President F.W. de Klerk's plans to abolish apartheid and extend full political rights to the 30-million black majority.

Police said six blacks died Thursday in clashes near Johannesburg including four killed in attacks on black train commuters.

Two people were found burned to death Thursday in Alexandra, a township wracked by violence this week.

Russian crime rate rises dramatically

MOSCOW — Crime rose by nearly a third in Russia in the first two months of 1992 compared with the same period last year, a newspaper reported Thursday.

Komsomolskaya Pravda, quoting Russian Interior Ministry figures, said property crime, often including violence, was among the fastest growing, accounting for 67.4 percent of all reported crimes.

Crimes involving weapons rose 31.4 percent, and crimes against foreigners were up 49 percent, the newspaper said. Overall, 376,899 crimes were reported during the first two months of this year, up 30.7 percent over January and February of 1991, it said.

Israeli soldiers kill armed Palestinian

JERUSALEM — Israeli troops on Thursday shot and killed an armed Palestinian while detaining dozens of activists in a security sweep in the occupied territories, the army said.

The suspects rounded up were mostly activists of the Black Panthers, an arm of the PLO's mainstream Fatah movement, an army statement said. Many are accused of involvement in slayings of Arabs accused of collaborating with Israel.

The clash occurred in the Jenin refugee camp where border patrol troops conducted a roundup at about 1 a.m. The troops shot and seriously wounded activist Khalid Mohammed Fahmawi, 49, after he drew a pistol at them, the army said. He later died at an army clinic, it added.

Azerbaijan reports heavy shelling

BAKU, Azerbaijan — Azerbaijan said its western city of Agdam came under heavy shelling Thursday in the battle over Nagorno-Karabakh, killing at least 25 people and shattering a cease-fire worked out hours earlier.

Armenian authorities denied targeting Agdam, and countered that Azerbaijan rockets hit Nagorno-Karabakh's capital, Stepanakert, and also killed three people in the village of Karachinar.

Armenian militants, meanwhile, released 10 former Soviet soldiers they had held hostage since Sunday, and at a news conference in Moscow, one of the freed captives spoke bitterly of being taken captive by the counterparty of people he had helped rescue following the 1988 Armenian earthquake.

Fighting has raged for four years in Nagorno-Karabakh, a mostly Armenian territory in the southern Caucasus Mountains that is controlled by Azerbaijan.

North Korea denies sending Scuds to Iran

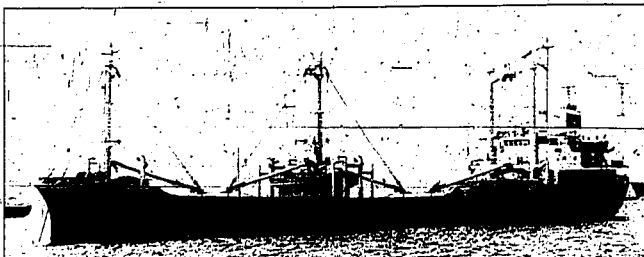
CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — North Korea's vice president on Thursday disputed U.S. claims that a ship from his country carried a load of Scud missiles to Iran after ignoring Pentagon threats it might be stopped.

The incident drew a strong condemnation Thursday from Syrian President Hafez Assad, who said the United States was trying to deny arms to Arabs in an effort to strengthen Israel's position at the Middle East peace talks.

Iranian newspapers said Washington was waging psychological warfare against Shiite Islamic state but claimed the Americans backed away from trying to stop the ship because of the potential for confrontation.

Neither paper addressed the U.S. allegation that Scuds were aboard the freighter Dae Hung Ho when it arrived at the Iranian port of Bandar Abbas on Monday after getting past U.S. Navy ships and planes searching for it.

Washington said Scud-C missiles aboard the ship were believed bound for Iran and Syria. The missile's 360-mile range would allow Iran to strike nearly all of Iraq and the east-

ern side of the Arabian Peninsula and Syria to hit any part of Israel.

Assad denied any missiles were being shipped to his country. But he said Syria had such missiles and would buy more if it needed them.

Li Jong Ok, the North Korean vice president, said during a visit in Cairo that U.S. allegations about the ship's cargo were false.

"There is absolutely no truth in these reports," Li said in Korean through an Arabic interpreter in response to a reporter's question: He did not say what the ship carried and would not take any other questions.

A dispatch Thursday from North Korea's official news agency criticized the United States for threatening North Korean shipping but did not specifically deny the Dae Hung Ho carried Scuds.

Iran's official news agency quoted the radical Farsi-language newspaper Salam as saying the "ballyhoo (over-the-freighter) was part of a psychological warfare against the Islamic Republic."

The agency quoted another Iranian paper, the English-language Kayhan International, as saying Washington decided not to intercept the ship to avert a confrontation that might escalate into a military showdown.

Kurds say Iraq is stepping up attacks

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Iraq is escalating military operations against Kurdish rebel-controlled territory and massing troops for a major offensive, a Kurdish spokesman said Thursday.

His comments came a day after President Saddam Hussein of Iraq warned the Kurds in a speech that they must not allow foreign interference in northern Iraq, which seemed to be a warning to cut ties with Western powers.

"These developments are clearly intended to intimidate the Kurds and prevent the staging of our referendum next month," said Basman Saleh, spokesman for the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan, the second-largest opposition group.

He said a car bomb explosion Sunday outside the front's headquarters in Sulaymaniyah, Iraq, that killed 12 people, and wounded at least 15, was part of Baghdad's intimidation policy.

The referendum on April 3 is to determine whether the Kurds should continue negotiations with Saddam on an autonomy pact, or join with other anti-Saddam forces working for his overthrow.

Saddam has moved four divisions of his Republican Guards south of Sulaymaniyah, the rebel-held capital of Iraqi Kurdistan, Saleh said in a

telephone interview from his base in suburban Washington, D.C.

He added that the massing of troops followed "several military operations against Kurdish positions in recent days."

"There was no independent confirmation of Saleh's information. Military analysts point out, however, that Iraq has only five Republican Guard divisions and most of these were reported deployed in southern Iraq to suppress a smoldering rebellion by the Arab Shiite population."

The Kurds in the north and the Shiites in the south both rebelled against Saddam in March 1991, taking advantage of Iraq's defeat in the Gulf War.

The Shiite rebellion was crushed, but the Kurds managed to retain control of most of their mountain region after the U.S.-led allied coalition created a safe haven and stopped Saddam from using his air power against them.

The reported fresh Iraqi operations came a few days before March 17, the Kurdish New Year's Day.

Ukraine stops arms removal, wants promises

MOSCOW (AP) — Ukraine on Thursday halted the shipment of tactical nuclear weapons to Russia for dismantling, adding to growing worries about the control of atomic arms in the former Soviet Union.

The action came the same day a senior official was quoted as warning that breakdowns in security have increased the risks that nuclear weapons will be stolen in places such as Nagorno-Karabakh, the war-torn southern enclave.

Ukraine's president, Leonid Kravchuk, said in Kiev that he wants firm assurances the weapons will be destroyed rather than redeployed by Russia. He suggested "Western nations help Ukraine build its own dismantling facility."

"We want guarantees that they can't be used anywhere. I don't want to make anybody else stronger," he said.

The unexpected announcement, coming a week before the start of a summit of the Commonwealth of Independent States in Kiev, appeared certain to widen the rift between Russia and Ukraine, the two largest former Soviet republics.

Runaway trolley kills 11, injures 30

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — A two-car trolley lost its electric power in a storm and hurtled backward down a hill Thursday, killing 11 people and injuring 30 as it crashed into cars and pedestrians, authorities said.

The train had been evacuated shortly before the mid-morning accident in Goteborg, Sweden's second-largest city, on the western coast. Most victims were waiting at a trolley stop at the bottom of the hill. Bibbi Wopenka, head of information for the Goteborg streetcar service, said the trolley was evacuated after it halted at a busy intersection because its electrical power lines were knocked out during a storm.

MISSOULA, Mont. — Boise State and Idaho State beat Idaho and Weber State, respectively, in the final games of the Big Sky Conference season to get into the league's season-ending tournament.

But they couldn't duplicate it on the neutral court at University of Montana Thursday and bowed out of the season. At Hamilton led five Weber players in double figures with 23 points as the Wildcats dominated Idaho State 92-74 in the opener.

Then Andre Whitney and Marv Ricks hit 15 straight free throws coming to the wire as Idaho bounced Boise State 75-56.

The results send Weber against Nevada and Idaho against top-seeded Montana in the semifinals tonight. The champion will earn a berth in the NCAA tournament.

Idaho, falling behind 20-14 on 28 percent shooting in the first 11 minutes, started asserting itself after that. The Vandals caught up at 27 and took the lead on Deion Watson's 14th first-half point at the halftime buzzer.

Idaho started pulling away after a 40-40 tie with 12:46 left in the game.

The big difference was the foul line as Whitney found 13 of his 23 points at the line and Ricks had seven of his 16 there, too.

Watson wound up with 21 — the same as BSU's junior star Tanoka Beard — as the Vandals' top gun, Orlando Lightfoot, didn't score in the first half and left on fouls with nine minutes left and six points.

Williams originally was suspended for one game by Big Sky Conference Commissioner Ron Stephenson for his part in the brawl.

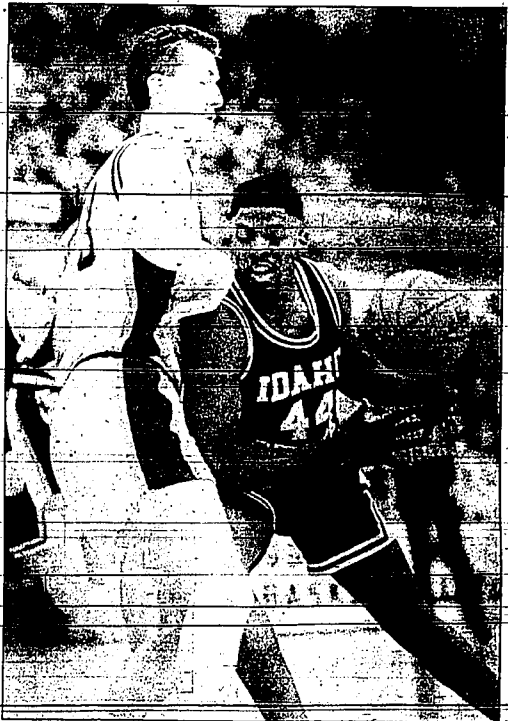
Williams got a court restraining order from a judge in Pocatello to allow him to coach, and Stephenson decided Wednesday night to withdraw the suspension.

NCAA tourney field likely to stir controversy

The envelope, please... Ooops, that's the Oscars. This is the NCAA. But wait a minute. The movies' big night? College basketball's big show? How different can they be? Not much.

More losers than winners. A long wait for actors and actresses, producers and directors, writers and choreographers until the announcements on the last Monday night in March; a long wait for players and coaches, fans and alumni, family and friends until the championship game on the first Monday night in April.

So, let's throw the tuxedo-and-evening gown crowd together with the trucks-and-jersey guys. Talk about the ultimate March Madness fantasy.

And that's what this is supposed to be, right?

ACC, SEC tourney results - A-6,7

Fantasy. That's what trying to figure out which 64 teams are going to land in the NCAA tournament field amounts to.

Go ahead. Study the conferences. Study the win-loss records. Study the strength of schedule. Study the last season streaks. Study everything.

It doesn't matter. Nine men, who locked themselves in a Kansas City, Mo., hotel suite Thursday night, are trying to do the same thing. Their problem is that they have to emerge Sunday evening and present a 64-team bracket to the country.

It's an impossible task, and the chairman of that selection committee knows it. Unanimity of opinion is seldom accomplished. "Frequently," said Southeastern Conference

commissioner Roy Kramer, "there are disagreements. You're probably talking about dealing with more than 100 teams."

Schedules must be determined. Regional routes must be considered and the four 16-team brackets somehow balanced. But the big debate will center on the clubs commonly referred to as "bubble teams." Those are the teams that come under consideration when the automatic bids (30) and so-called "locks" (20-25, depending on the number of conference-tournament upsets) have filled most of the bracket.

"Usually it's about triple (as many teams for available positions) once it gets to that point," Kramer said.

The parity of college basketball this season might make the ratio even more extreme — perhaps 35 or 40 teams trying to squeeze into as few as eight spots.

Paramount might buy Yankees, reports say

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — The New York Yankees, one of the most glamorous franchises in sports and estimated to be worth as much as \$300 million, may be up for sale.

Paramount Communications, owner of the New York Knicks, New York Rangers and Madison Square Garden, said Thursday that several of the Yankees' owners, including George Steinbrenner, have expressed an interest in discussing the sale of the team.

However, we have not received any concrete proposals, nor have we made any. Steinbrenner, who owns 55 percent of the team, confirmed the talks, which reportedly began two weeks ago. "I met with them and discussed a lot of things," he said after a meeting of the Yankee partners.

"But to say George Steinbrenner is leaving baseball and the Yankees or giving up ownership of the Yankees is

wrong. He had nice conversations that came about because nine men, four of our limited partners, who has wanted to sell his minority interest for some time, evidently had made contact with those people which is perfectly OK. He wondered if it would be acceptable as a limited partner."

Paramount is already involved with the Yankees through its ownership of the MSG Network and pays \$50 million per year for cable television rights to the team's games through the year 2000.

Obviously, we are concerned about the future of the team since we have a major investment in it through our long-

Swedish skipper sets mark for futility in America's Cup

SAN DIEGO — Sweden's Tre Kronor set a record for futility on Thursday by losing to Japan's Nippon by 1 hour, 15 minutes, the widest margin in the history of America's Cup competition.

The victory, less than five weeks after the aged, less than 50 knots, kept Nippon tied with New Zealand for first place in round three of the Challenger Selection Series.

Nippon and New Zealand, which routed seventh-place Challenge Australia by 42 minutes, 38 seconds, have 66 points apiece.

Italy's 11-Moro di Venezia downed France's Ville de Paris by 3 minutes, 14 seconds to move into sole possession of third place and assure a spot in the semifinal round. The eight-point win gave 11-Moro 53 points to Ville de Paris' 45 points.

Spirit of Australia won its second straight race, defeating fifth-place Espana '92 of Spain by 11:17. Spirit of Australia, in sixth place with 27 points, was eliminated on Wednesday from advancing to the semifinals.

Espana '92, which has 30 points, still has a chance to make the semifinals. But it

must win its final two races and Ville de Paris lose its final two races of the third round. The two boats will face off on Sunday.

In the defender trials, America3 padded its lead with a 55-second win over its America3 Foundation sister ship, Defiant. America3 has 40 points while second-place Defiant has 12. Dennis Conner's Stars & Stripes is third with 11 points.

Racing was delayed almost an hour by a lack of wind.

The wind dropped from 5 knots to nothing about an hour after the start. It picked up again, but didn't exceed 7 knots all afternoon.

The Nippon-Tre Kronor race came close to being abandoned, as Nippon beat the time limit on the second leg by just 24 seconds.

There are time limits on the first three legs. Had it been abandoned, the race would have had to have been resailed. The previous largest winning margin in America's Cup competition came in 1881 when the New York Yacht Club's Mischief defeated the Atlanta of Canada, by 36 minutes, 54 seconds.

Girls' bowling - a varsity sport?

2,500 ... and counting

LOS ANGELES — The last time Chick Hearn missed a Los Angeles Lakers game, Lincoln was preparing his Gettysburg Address, Jonas Salk was fooling around with cultures, and Thomas Edison was trying to get a spark out of filaments.

OK, so we exaggerate. It only seems like the irrepressible voice of the Lakers has been around since the Paleozoic Era. It's only so apparent that he once had a saber-toothed kitten as a pet.

But it has been an extraordinary long time. Friday night's game in Cleveland is number 2,500 in a re-

markable consecutive games streak that dates back to 1965 - or before "Mule" Dwyer, Elden Campbell, Tony Smith and a majority of NBA players, were born.

Since he became the Lakers' play-by-play man in 1961, the only one they've ever had, Hearn's missed just two games - and in 1962, when he had a conflict with an NBC golf assignment, and in November 1965, when a snowstorm idled him in Indiana after a Notre Dame football game for three days.

"Jack Kent Cooke (the former owner) had a Lear jet ready for me, and I read a police car in the airport," Hearn said of his miss in 1965. "But when I got there, the pilot said,

"We're not going anywhere. The weather's too bad to fly. I'm scared. I said, 'If you're scared, baby, so am I.'"

"But the streak is the highlight of my career. When I hit 1,000 straight, I didn't think anything of it at all. When it got to be 2,000, I knew it was getting pretty fancy. Now it's 2,500 ... and they're not counting exhibitions, either."

It's a testimonial to his dedication and personal hardihood to be undefeated at the opening tip for 27 straight years, and a salute to his talent that management has had no inclination to find someone younger or allegedly better or politically correct.

Witt's testimony keys conviction of obsessed fan

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif. (AP) — Jurors who heard figure skater Katarina Witt testify she lived in fear of an obsessed fan convicted him Thursday of sending threatening and obscene mail to the two-time Olympic gold medalist.

"It's a sad ending today of a really sad story," federal Public Defender H. Dean Steward said outside court. Harry Weltman really loved this woman and his love turned into an obsession."

Weltman, 47, of Westminster, who acted as his own attorney, was convicted on four counts of sending obscene mail and two counts of sending threatening mail to the Alton, Germany, home of Witt, 26.

"I am very relieved and appreciative of the jury's verdict," Witt said in a statement.

"Hopefully, this case can make it possible for other people in the entertainment world to feel that something can be done."

"For now, I would like to put this episode behind me and get on with my life," she said. The skater, who was in Toronto, released her comments through spokeswoman Pat Kingsley in Los Angeles.

Weltman faces a maximum prison term of 24 to 36 months when he is sentenced June 1 under federal guidelines, said Steward, who assisted the defendant and will represent him in the sentencing phase.

The case presented numerous issues for appeal, Steward said.

MONEY falls from seniors circuit

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP) — The MONY Syracuse Senior Golf Classic has been dropped from the Senior PGA Tour, officials said Thursday.

The 10-year-old tournament, one of the Senior PGA's original stops, fell victim to the recession as organizers said they could not attract enough sponsors to continue to hold the 54-hole tournament at the Lafayette Country Club.

The revised Senior schedule now shows an open date for June 19-21, when the tournament would have been played, said Gary Camp, the tournament's chairman.

Meanwhile, local businessman Bill Motto, an assistant organizer of the last several tournaments, said he is trying to keep the door open for a return to the Senior Tour.

Motto said he is trying to arrange a one-day, pro-am event to bring 12

to 15 of the senior pros to Syracuse. Then, when the economy turns upward, he would try to land a sponsor and bring the tournament back, he said.

"Motto's dream is a longshot because of Senior Tour requirements."

"At this stage, any new group from Syracuse would be treated as a new event," said Tim Crosby, director of communications and sponsor services for the Senior Tour.

Clearwater who tied for second Sunday when Floyd scored his first victory in six years.

"It's a mental situation," Floyd said.

"Obviously, I'm playing well because I won last week. I don't see anything that would change the quality of my game from then to now."

"Often you have a letdown after winning. It didn't happen to me. "I played beautifully on the front

Board president: We support learning

MOSCOW — Faculty at Idaho's three universities and colleges see the State Board of Education as more foe than friend of the state's higher education system, the chairman of Boise State University's Faculty Senate says.

But board president Cullen Maloney of Lewiston says the eight-member panel supports education, even though it asks tough questions and some of its decisions aren't popular.

Maloney, who is the board's executive director, Rayburn Barton, BSU Faculty Senate Chairman Donald Oakes said campuses perceive the board "as adversarial toward higher education rather than supportive."

The associate professor of music said concern began with the board's firing of Boise State President John Keiser last September and now centers on a proposal requiring Idaho's four-year schools to report continuing activities of their faculty.

Oakes declined in an interview with the Lewiston Tribune on Wednesday to specifically name any board members as adversaries of Idaho's higher education system. But he said his views are shared by faculty and administrators around the state.

Boise fire sends neighbors scrambling

BOISE — Fire gutted a Boise lumber mill and sent neighbors scrambling to protect their belongings.

The blaze at Mark Line Supply, started shortly before 1 p.m. Wednesday and burned for several hours. Nearly 40 firefighters were able to contain the fire before it spread to area residences.

Investigators determined the fire was accidental and started when a sawdust in a dust collection and removal system ignited, Boise Fire Marshal Steve Minnis said. Minnis said the mill was destroyed.

Gusty winds and the mile to the nearest fire hydrant complicated efforts to douse the flames.

Hydro plant construction begins

HORSESHOE BEND — A Salt Lake City company has begun construction on some phases of a hydroelectric project on the Payette River at Horseshoe Bend to keep its federal permit from expiring.

The Horseshoe Bend Electric Co. started work Tuesday on parts of the project that do not come into contact with the river, wetlands or riparian zone.

"It got a little too close for comfort," said David Hirsch, owner of the firm that is backing the \$20 million project. On Friday, Hirsch received the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission documents that allowed him to begin certain phases of construction.

Hirsch still must get a state permit from the Idaho Division of Environmental Quality. Once that is obtained, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers can make a final decision.

Man buried in avalanche is found

TETONIA — Searchers have found the body of an Idaho man who was buried about two weeks ago in an avalanche in western Wyoming's Teton National Park.

Volunteers found the body of Dan Schwendiman, 22, of Newdale, about 4 p.m. Wednesday on the north side of a pile of avalanche debris, said Teton County, Wyo., Sheriff Roger Millward. Schwendiman was buried in four to five feet of snow, about 85 feet downhill from where his snowmobile was found Tuesday afternoon, the sheriff said.

Swendiman was killed Feb. 29 in the avalanche on Rammed Mountain on the Teton Crest northeast of Tetonika. Snowmobile travel in the area is prohibited. Schwendiman's brother and a friend escaped the avalanche without serious injury.

Dinner train expected to attract crowd

SANDPOINT — A train with a dinner car to take passengers on a scenic 28-mile ride between Sandpoint and Newport, Wash., could be a big tourist draw, proponents say.

"We need things for people who arrive on a rainy Wednesday in June to do," Jonathan Coe, director of the Sandpoint Chamber of Commerce, said Wednesday. "We don't have all our ducks in a line. This is clearly not ready to roll tomorrow, but I think it is very feasible."

The communities of Sandpoint, nearby Priest River and Newport have a David Duncanson owner of Northwest Tours in Portland, Ore., to study the project.

Promoters envision a Pend Oreille riverfront route on Burlington Northern Railroad tracks. Obstacles include getting permission from the railroad to operate a pleasure train on a freight line and finding a train, an operator and insurance, he said.

Brush fire claims Blackfoot resident

BLACKFOOT — A Blackfoot man died of smoke inhalation when a brush fire got out of hand in his backyard.

Danny Daniels, 78, was burning brush Wednesday when the smoke became too thick. He was found dead near the fire around 4 p.m., Blingham County sheriff's officials said.

The fire also destroyed a shed containing a tractor and a boat. The damage was estimated at \$7,000.

Education official bolsters school aid plan

BOISE (AP) — Idaho's top education administrator warned lawmakers on Thursday that his own party's controversial state support plan for public schools will cut operational support from current levels in 1993.

"It is less," Republican-state schools superintendent Jerry Evans said. "I just don't know how to change the numbers."

Evans' analysis, provided to the Senate Education Committee, came on the eve of Senate action on the House-passed \$496.9 million state aid budget. The package is \$5 million less than Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus proposed and provides no money for school reform, which was



on the agenda of almost every lawmaker when the 1992 legislative session began.

The report from Evans also reinforced Senate Democrats' confidence that they have the support of more than the one Republican they need to block passage of the reduced education allotment. Democrats want the total pushed back toward the level recommended by Andrus, and Education Committee Chairman John Hansen, R-Idaho Falls, has

joined them in the campaign to restore some education reform to the package.

Evans made it clear on Thursday that launching any reform initiative without adding cash to the GOP-backed plan would only widen the gap in state operating support.

Based on a series of assumptions about the school system for the coming year, Evans said 38 of the 113 school districts would receive less in state operating aid next year than they are getting this year, and eight would still see increased enrollment.

Andrus squeezed nearly every other state agency budget to recommend the 2.9-percent increase in state support for schools next year, while conceding even that was inadequate. But Republicans, concerned over Idaho's slowing economic expansion, sliced \$5 million from the \$501.9 million proposal and warned that following what they called Andrus' overly optimistic budget recommendations would force a tax increase next year.

Still, the Republican-dominated budget committee has overspent the conservative budget target of GOP leaders. "With its work effectively complete, the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee's budget plan is about \$6 million higher than the spending level Republicans see as a buffer against a tax hike."

Both proposals exceed the \$487.5 million provided public education this school year. But the additional cash in the reduced Republican alternative will be consumed by increasing costs for transportation and teacher benefits, which are paid for by the state before operating support is calculated.

Coupled with continuing enrollment increases, Evans said operating support for each classroom equivalent in the state will actually decline by about \$50 dollars under the GOP plan.

Each \$1 million of the Republican total that's set aside for school reform would widen the gap by another \$76 per classroom, he said.

Tax break for elderly poor, disabled passes

BOISE (AP) — The Legislature's last chance to counteract a grassroots campaign to cap property taxes was sent to Gov. Cecil Andrus on Thursday.

The 50-percent increase in the maximum benefit under the circuit-breaker property tax relief program for the disabled and elderly poor cleared the Senate with just six opposing votes.

"This is pure property tax relief, and its property tax relief for those who need it the most," said Senate tax committee Chairman Jerry Thorne, R-Nampa.

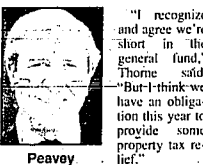
Thorne and others admitted the two-year benefit improvement package would probably do little to restrain backers of the One Percent Initiative to cap property taxes at 1 percent of actual market value.

Analysts estimate that, if approved by voters in November, the cap would siphon more than \$100 million a year from local government and school district treasuries each year.

"I don't think it's enough to head it off, but it'll help," Democrat John Peavey of Carey said.

The bill increases from \$400 to \$600 this year and then to \$800 next year the maximum amount of property taxes the state will pay for eligible homeowners. The cost to the general treasury is \$1.1 million this year and another \$700,000 next year.

Those outlays will only aggravate the deficit problem facing legislative budget writers.



"I recognize and agree we're short in the general fund," Thorne said. "But I think we have an obligation this year to provide some property tax relief."

The increased benefit was the only piece of Andrus' property tax relief package to survive legislative review.

House tax-writers summarily rejected the governor's proposals to extend the circuit-breaker program to all poor property owners regardless of age or disability. Andrus wanted to include the land as well as the house in the homeowner's exemption calculation, provide a buffer against spiraling assessments and finance the entire thing with a modest fee on all real estate transactions.

The circuit-breaker is currently providing property tax help for some 21,000 people, mostly senior citizens, at a cost of about \$4.5 million a year.

The opposition to the bill came from conservative Republicans who called it pandering to the fear of the One Percent Initiative.

House defeats littering bill

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho House defeated "46-36" a bill that would have increased penalties for littering from \$300 to \$1,000.

Opponents argued the penalty in the bill sponsored by Rep. Dolores Crow, R-Nampa, was too great for some instances of littering, such as when children throw things from a car without their parents' knowledge.

"I've had that happen to me. There ought to be some provision in the bill to allow that, to allow that there was no intent to litter," said Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley.

Current law contains a possible jail term of up to 10 days, but legislators say it may never be imposed. The failed legislation would have repealed the jail term and permitted judges to require litterers to spend up to four days picking up trash.

Budget would squeeze valley schools

BOISE - Fewer services and higher property taxes are in store if the Legislature passes a \$496.9 million public-school budget, Magic Valley superintendents said Thursday.

Their comments came after Superintendent of Public Instruction Jerry Evans released figures showing how individual school districts would be affected by the budget, which is \$5 million less than what Gov. Cecil Andrus had proposed.

Most districts would face either budget cuts or small increases, which administrators said would not be nearly enough to compensate for expected enrollment increases.

The school budget has become this session's biggest battle between Andrus, a Democrat, and the Republican-controlled Legislature.

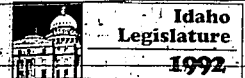

Republicans - Lajud Noh of Kimberly, John Hansen of Idaho Falls and Edward Osborne of Boise - have either expressed grave doubts about the bill or flat-out said they'll oppose it.

All three men sit on the Senate Education Committee, where Evans - also a Republican - presented his figures Thursday morning.

"Although he did not specifically endorse Andrus' position, Evans' central point was that about \$5 million will be needed to maintain current operations, given the 5,000 additional children he estimates will enroll in school for the 1992-1993 year.

The districts facing the biggest cuts, Evans said, are those whose enrollments decline or stay the same and which have to have a large property tax base to draw on.

Idaho Power board gives go-ahead on request for temporary rate boost

BOISE - Idaho Power Co.'s board of directors has approved the company's plan to ask state utility regulators for a one-year, 4.65-percent rate increase to help offset higher generating costs caused by drought.

The company said in a statement issued Thursday that it expects to spend almost \$91 million to produce electricity this year. Generating costs average \$48.5 million in normal water years, Idaho Power said.

"Our temporary rate increase request is designed to evenly split these drought-related expenses between our customers and our share owners," Joe Marshall, chairman and chief executive officer, said in the statement.

If approved by the Idaho Public Utilities Commission, the 12-month surcharge

would generate \$17.9 million, which Idaho Power said amounted to half the additional costs attributable to the company's Idaho service area.

Shareholders would bear the other half. The surcharge would be Idaho Power's second since the latest drought began six years ago. The company won approval of a similar one-year, 1.72-percent hike in 1988. It brought in \$5.4 million.

Marshall said on Tuesday that the water supply for Idaho Power hydroelectric plants in the Snake River basin could

approach that of 1977: the state's worst drought year on record. That forecast was supported by the Idaho Water Supply Committee on Wednesday.

Idaho Power traditionally generates about two-thirds of its electricity from relatively inexpensive hydro plants. But since 1988, the utility has been relying on about 50 percent water power and 50 percent from more expensive coal-fired plants in Nevada and Wyoming.

Besides the surcharge request, Marshall said Idaho Power is containing its costs by cutting its \$149.8 million construction budget for this year by almost \$33 million. It also is trimming operations and maintenance expenses.

The utility said it would ask the Public Utilities Commission to make the rate increase effective April 27.

Exploding hydrant hurts Hailey firefighter

HAILEY - A Hailey volunteer firefighter was injured Thursday morning when a fire hydrant set was working on a routine flood.

Diana Mysinger was conducting a flood test on a hydrant installed last year on Forest Bend Road in Hailey's

South Woodside Subdivision. Mysinger released the outlet cap on the faulty hydrant, but discovered too late it was under pressure when it should not have been, Fire Chief Dan Chapman said.

The cast-iron cap struck Mysinger's side, followed by a stream of water estimated to be under 115 pounds of pressure. The force of the water lifted her up and threw her 10 feet through the air.

Mysinger was listed in good condition Thursday night in the Hailey branch of the Wood River Medical Center where doctors were keeping her overnight for observation and to determine if she suffered any internal injuries, Chapman said.

Officials from the State Insurance Fund and a third-party attorney will handle the investigation with the city.



George Hansen Says he'll pay off debt

Hansen bankruptcy case moves to Idaho

ALEXANDRIA, Va. - George Hansen's Chapter 11 bankruptcy petition has been moved to Idaho.

The action came Wednesday after the former Republican congressman failed to convince a court in Alexandria that he can keep his promise to repay his debts.

An optimistic Hansen said there's no question he'll pay back the \$19.5 million he owes 180 businesses and individuals who did business with him or invested in his money-making schemes.

But outside the courtroom, his lawyer said Hansen is flat broke. "He doesn't have an

income," lawyer George Biondi of McLean, Va., said as Hansen looked on. "And the repayment plan doesn't give him an income, which he needs badly."

Moments earlier, asked if he would be able to pay off his debts, Hansen said, "The answer is a categorical yes." Leaving the courthouse, he told Bankruptcy Trustee Jack Frankel, "We've got the contracts rolling now, so we're going to take care of everything."

U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Douglas O. Tice ordered the transfer after Frankel repeated his doubts that a repayment plan submitted by Hansen last May would pan out.

That plan calls for Hansen to sell a painting business in Pocatello and use the money to pay

back creditors - mostly Idahoans - over three years. If no payment plan can be worked out, his Chapter 11 petition could be converted to a Chapter 7 filing, which would force him to liquidate his assets. Hansen served nearly a year in prison in 1987 for falsifying his financial reports to Congress.

On Wednesday, Hansen dismissed as "ridiculous" speculation that his case might be converted to Chapter 7. Biondi said creditors would be better served through a Chapter 11 bankruptcy "and they get paid."

Two weeks ago Hansen argued in an interview against a cross-country move of his case on grounds that it would disrupt his ability to represent him.

BUHL—Buhl officials want to change the names of some streets outside of town, but some folks say they like things the way they are.

Up to 30 people attended a recent Buhl City Council meeting, offering suggestions on what to name the streets — or just urging officials to leave the names as they are.

The name changes will affect residents living outside the city limits, but within the town's impact zone.

Many residents didn't understand why they would now have street names instead of county grid numbers for address, adding they preferred the numbering system.

City Council members approved the new concept for addresses at last month's meeting.

The public hearing was scheduled to seek input on the names for streets and roads, before the new system is finalized.

A few residents asked officials to make specific name changes.

Hearing on proposed landfill on hold

TWIN FALLS—County residents who want to air their feelings about a regional landfill near Hansen will have to wait one more month.

A public hearing on a conditional-use permit for the facility was canceled Thursday night because a landowner near the proposed site was not notified of the hearing.

The first used to notify property owners of the hearing did not include the one landowner, said Jerry Schultze of the South Central District Health Department.

With such a touchy issue hanging in the balance, officials decided to postpone the meeting and make sure all the eligible property owners are notified. The hearing before the Twin Falls County Planning Commission likely will be held next month, Schultze said.

Six Magic Valley counties, including Twin Falls County, want to put a regional landfill five miles east of Hansen and south of Highway 20. To do so, the counties need a conditional-use permit and a hearing before the Planning Commission.

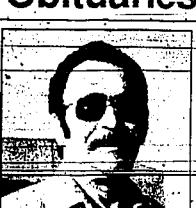

Environmentalists suggest huge package of desert national parks

IDAHO FALLS (AP)

Legislation that would preserve 4.5 million acres across Idaho's deserts as national parks and monuments is being proposed by a state environmental group.

The Committee for Idaho's High Desert has unveiled the Idaho High Desert Protection Act as its plan for saving the plateaus, canyons, lava flows and desert valleys.

The bill, which has no congressional support yet, would establish two national parks, two national monuments, five preserves, four national wildlife refuges, and 30 wilderness areas. It would also add 53 segments of desert rivers to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers system. "We're really just pulling together things we've been talking about for years," said Randy Morris, a Mountain Home dentist who heads the committee.

Brackett said the bill would put

hundred of Idaho ranching families out of business.

"The BLM, which controls more than 11 million acres in Idaho, standard 1.8 million acres of roadless land, mostly desert, for suitability for wilderness. It recommended 27 areas covering 972,239 acres for wilderness designation.

The Bush administration is studying the BLM proposal and must make its own recommendation by October 1993.

The desert act would establish an Owyhee National Park to protect the canyons in the southwest corner of Idaho. It would create a Great Rift National Park, greatly increasing the size of Craters of the Moon National Monument.

The St. Anthony Sand Dunes in Fremont County would be designated a national monument.

reduced flow into the river will not affect the flow of spring water that comes up all along the Malad Gorge.

Lynnott said he is concerned about some erosion from the plant disrupting the unstable ground along both sides of the canyon rim, which includes Malad Gorge State Park.

With 320 cfs flowing through the plant, the impact could cause the basalt canyon walls to fall, Lynnott said.

He requested that this matter and other geological impacts be included in the studies.

In answering other concerns raised by some of the 20-plus people who attended the hearing, Ravenscroft said:

Water will be cleaner at the end

of his hydro project than at the beginning. Still will be removed and sent to the diversion with sludge and trash.

"The bore hole to the plant will be lined and will be stabilized."

"The first plan for this same project was rejected by the energy commission because it had too many changes in it."

"Private parties are being paid for use of their land where the projects pipe and ditch lines will be."

"That describes Buhl to a T," said Superintendent Eric Pyles, when told of the impact the budget would have on his district.

Buhl District is expected to receive about \$2.6 million this fiscal year from the state, including more than \$42,000 in one-time money. That's about 75 percent of the district's total maintenance and operations budget, Pyles said.

The district would lose about \$26,600 next year if its enrollment stays the same, according to Evans' estimates, about \$47,700 if its enrollment declines slightly, as it did this year.

Although that may not seem like much, Pyles said, "It's bad news for Buhl, that's for sure."

Services that don't directly affect students, such as maintenance, will be the first to be cut if that becomes necessary, he said, adding "Hopefully, it wouldn't get down to textbooks and classroom supplies."

The Cassia County district would either lose about \$43,000 if its enrollment stays constant or gain about \$155,000 if its enrollment rises the way it did this year.

Superintendent Norm Hurst said that either way, the district would have to trim staff or ask the voters for a supplemental levy.

"This probably isn't the best solution," said Hurst, who helped win approval of a \$575,000 supplemental levy last year. "But otherwise we'll have to put a hold on our efforts to reduce class size."

One Magic Valley district that

wouldn't be much affected is Blaine County. Superintendent Bill Homer said, "But that's because Blaine gets only 6.4 percent of its operating budget from the state, a far lower percentage than most counties."

The complex funding formula that determines how much state aid local districts receive takes two major factors into account: the number of students in a district and the district's property tax base. Because property values in Blaine are so high and it has relatively few students, the district will receive only \$569,000 from the state during this fiscal year.

That would fall to \$523,000 next year if enrollment stays constant and \$539,000 if it grows by 6 percent like it did last year, Homer said.

"I've become the other folks out there because I think they need and deserve more money from the Legislature as far as being willing to give them, but as far as Blaine County is concerned, it won't affect us that much," Homer said.

Hansen, who chairs the Education

Committee, called the figures sobering. Nab, the vice chairman said they shouldn't surprise anyone.

"I think we all realize that with the high cost of benefits and supplies, this (\$446.0 million package) would be a pretty sparse budget," Nab said.

The Senate is expected to vote on the public schools funding package this afternoon or sometime Monday.

Film critic answers readers' questions about his life on the job

A recent column — in which I did my best to answer 10 commonly asked questions about the movie business — has certainly rattled cages out there. In response to further inquiries, I now present "Q & A: The Sequel."

Q: How many movies do you see each year?

A: Five per week is average, which works out to something like 250 movies per year. I review around half of them.

Q: Do you take notes at the movies?

A: Yes, but not many. I'm a big believer in experiencing the movie, not transcribing it. Besides, I've always had a very good memory for films. Generally speaking, I write down occasional lines of dialogue so

that I can quote them precisely in a review or in this column. If, while watching a film, I have what seems at the time like a particularly brilliant insight, I may jot it down. (When I'm writing my review, such insights have a way of seeming less brilliant.) A really bad movie sometimes doodle to stay awake.

Q: What do you look for in a movie?

A: Like almost everyone else, I

want to be entertained — although entertainment can mean many things to me. My taste ranges from comedy to drama, romance to horror, action pictures to films that defy categorization. Q: In the bad things, a movie can do its surprise. Bad pictures and usually bad in the same ways, the best films tend to be of a kind.

Q: What's your favorite movie theater?

A: Any one without a noisy baby in it.

Q: Do you and why did you become a movie critic?

A: I started writing movie reviews for my college newspaper 20 years ago, and I've kept at reviewing — with brief interruptions for sleep and oil changes — ever since. I chose this line of work because I love movies and writing and because I'm fascinated by why people — myself

included — respond to movies as we do. It's also nice to see movies for free.

Q: How do you decide how many stars to give to a movie?

A: Simple. If, overall, I enjoy a movie, I give it at least four stars. If a movie is one of my 10 or 15 favorites of the year, it'll get five stars. I give one or two stars to a movie I don't like, depending on how often I look at my watch. Movies I'm iffy about get three stars.

Q: Do you ever get tired of going to the movies?

A: Not very often, although I do tend to get a little "movied-out" when I attend a film festival and watch up to three movies per day for up to 10 days.

Q: Do you ever walk out on a bad movie?

A: Only once in a while, and when I do, I always mention it in my review. (Most recently, I recall vividly — deciding to leave in the middle of "Tango and Cash.") I probably should walk out on more of them, but whenever I'm tempted

to do that, I think, "What if this movie somehow becomes a mega-hit? Then, I'll be forced to come back and sit through the whole lousy thing just so I'll be informed about it. That prospect is usually horrifying enough to keep me in my seat."

Q: What are your favorite and least-favorite movies of all time?

A: My favorite American movie is Orson Welles' "Citizen Kane" (1941) although there are many that finish a close second. My all-time favorite from any country is "Children of Paradise" (1944), a lyrical French film about show business. (It was made during the Nazi Occupation, which ought to prove that it's possible to do exceptional work under miserable circumstances.)

And my least-favorite movie?

There are too many to choose. Let's just say that if a film features oddities whose thoughts are voiced by celebrities, more than a dozen explosions or Steve Guttenberg, it's probably in the

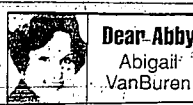

Rain forest suspense film puts medical remedy at center of plot

I think that I shall never see a movie so lovely as a free and "Medicine Man" confirms that suspicion.

Review

A medical what-dun-it with overtones of ecological orthodoxy and metaphorical fancy, the movie isn't bad so much as unfinished. It's as if John McTiernan, the action director

working from notes rather than a script. This is his "Apocalypse Now," and he still hasn't found an ending.

Like "Apocalypse," this one is about an arduous upriver journey through a merciless jungle; the difference is in the destination, which is a heart of lightness. That is, a cure for "the plague of the 20th century — cancer."

Lorraine Bracco plays Dr. Rae Crane, a Brooklyn-bred biochemist who is a high-muck-and-bunny-at-a-large pharmaceutical company; she's venturing deep into the Amazon basin to locate the mysterious Dr. Robert Campbell, whom her company has been blithely supporting—all these years in his medical peregrinations through the jungles. But he's been out of contact for three years and

—funds are running low; Campbell is of course played by Sean Connery, that monstrously charming Scot who could turn "King Lear" into a drawing room comedy.

Here, he doesn't seem to work very hard and he doesn't seem to care much for either Bracco or McTiernan (with whom he worked on "Hunt for Red October"), but still his buoyancy keeps the movie from slipping off into true tedium.

The gimmick of the film is that

the magic will be gone forever; the second is the sudden appearance of a throat tumor in a small child, which McTiernan will be astonished if they don't use the last sample of the original brew.

The medical "mystery" at the core of the story is so simple I solved it 20 minutes before the stars did, and was even smart enough to get rejected by a medical school! The ending feels rushed and unconvincing, as if it was improvised on the last day before Connery took off for the nearest golf course. Worse, the argument concealed within the film itself is unappealing: that in the Amazon rain forest, there may indeed lurk medical secrets—yet undiscovered. But that's not why it should be saved from the strip malls and new Reisterstown of Brazil. It should be saved because it's the Amazon rain forest and it helps the whole world breathe. To save it is to save the planet's lungs.

Additionally, the movie is in some sense constructed also as a Pat-and-Tracy show of the sort Hepburn and Tracy used to put on, with the two principals spitting like cats locked in a shoe box while they grow toward respect and love. This is the kind of routine drollery that Connery can perform asleep, and he does—steppe. Bracco is less fortunate: For the first hour, her performance is a

long one-note howl of that car-as-saulting Bronx accent. Still, the movie is far from a disgrace, which makes one wonder why the studio (Disney) was so timorous in not screening it for critics before its release. McTiernan has a genuine affection for the people who live so harmoniously within it. In fact,

among the best characters in the film are his natives, who are presented as a tolerant, wise and ironic people, with a real sense of humor. The jungle — actually a hunk of southern Mexico — is picturesque as Eden and Sean Connery's ponytail will remind you of the nearly extinct bushy-tailed ring-eyed tree squirrel.

Sean Connery still draws visceral response

Stars as eccentric scientist in 'Medicine Man' film

NEW YORK — He's still tall, dark and handsome. Unlike Samson, his presence is just as potent without a full head of hair. When he walks over to pour himself a cup of steaming tea, he ignores the dainty spoon nestled in the saucer. He plunges a large hand into the cup, squeezes the teabag with fingers, tosses it aside and takes a big gulp.

The name? Connery. Sean Connery.

At 62, Connery is beginning his fourth decade as an actor with the vigor and commercial appeal of a man half his age. In his latest film, the adventure drama "Medicine Man" from Hollywood Pictures, he portrays an eccentric biochemist who has discovered a cure for cancer in the Amazon rain forest. His love interest, Lorraine Bracco, is young enough to be his daughter. Don't worry, Connery never comes across as paternal.

His career has spanned more than 30 years of serious theater and films but Connery has grown accustomed to the visceral reaction he evokes as one of the screen's most enduring sex symbols.

When People magazine called two years ago to get his response to the news that he had been anointed "The Sexiest Man Alive," Connery was not impressed.

"I told them there are very few who are dead," he said.

Connery in person is more complex than the debonair, tongue-in-cheek rogue he made famous — super-sleazy James Bond. But like Bond, he knows what he wants and he gets it.

For one, don't make the mistake of ordering him a martini, shaken not stirred. "I don't drink martinis," Connery barks. "Give me a vodka with a lime tonic. Or, give me a Scotch."

Though he may be as quick-witted as Bond, Connery is more serious and Businesslike. From the time he dropped out of school at 13, Connery has had to make his own way — without many compromises.

"All the choices I've made were mine, both the wrong ones and the right ones," says Connery.

His way has served him well — in addition to seven wildly successful Bond films, Connery has starred in such movies as "Marnie," "Murder on the Orient Express," "The Wind and the Lion," "A Bridge Too Far" and "The Hunt for Red October." He

won an Academy Award for best supporting actor for "The Untouchables" in 1987.

Connery is not one to lapse into sentimentality. He keeps his eye on the bottom line.

"I have very little memory of the past," Connery says pleasantly, "which is strange for someone who's in litigation a lot."

Connery explains. Ever since he began making movies, he has hired an auditor to check the books and make sure he is getting all money due him.

"I've been doing it since the very beginning," he says. "It used to be policy to blackmail people who were difficult in that way."

It apparently has been just business for Connery as well, ever since

he made his debut in a stage production of "South Pacific" in 1951.

Most people think Arnold Schwarzenegger was the first to parlay a bodybuilding career into movie fame. But Connery, who left Scotland to pursue bodybuilding in London, is the true father of all manly men. He missed out on being named Mr. Universe but got the part in "South Pacific" partly because of his physique.

But Connery says he was no winner near the level of today's bodybuilders — or even some of his fellow coastguards.

"When I stood next to some of them at Mr. Universe, I looked like a girl," he says.

A girl? If that statement sounds sexist, well, Connery has heard that charge before. Every since Connery talked about hitting women on a Barbara Walters TV special several years ago, he's been stamped as a unrepentant cave man.

Not true, says Connery. He insists

the statements he made to Walters were taken out of context. "What I had said was that you could do worse things to a woman," he says. "You could take their identity away and reduce the person to nothing. Barbara was looking for something and she edited it in such a way that I came out like a wife beater, which I'm not."

Connery says he meant to explain his belief that couples sometimes get into physical confrontations that are more complicated than simply victim and victimizer. When emotions run high, he said, anything can happen.

"I was in Coventry once and I saw a man hitting a woman across the street from me," Connery says. "I ran over and pulled him off. There was no doubt that if he had continued, she'd be in serious trouble. But that's what I had said, not hit me."

Has a woman? he was involved with ever hit Mr. Connery nods.

"And when they hit you, you're aware that if you do anything in response, you can do real harm," he says. "But it's hard to control yourself."

But Connery was able to control himself when he unexpectedly ran into physical confrontations that are special aired.

"She was a little embarrassed," says Connery, pausing for a beat and with a sly smile worthy of James Bond, "but not for long."

Computer game caters to Japan-bashers

TOKYO — Who says Japan bashing can't be fun and games? In a new computer game, players can choose one of 400 ways to slam Japan as they try to influence troubled U.S.-Japan relations.

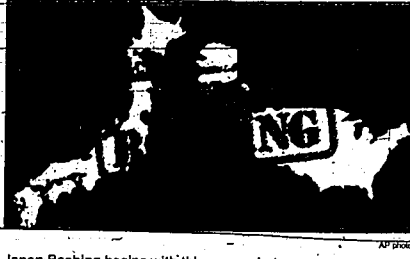
The game, no surprise, is called Japan Bashing and is scheduled to hit stores in Japan on March 27. There are no plans now for an English version or U.S. sales.

The game's maker, SystemSoft Corp., says it is meant to get Japanese thinking about U.S.-Japan relations, not in flame hostility between the longtime allies.

Still, thanks to real-life U.S.-Japan frictions, the software company hopes the \$66 game is a hit.

"No one predicted there was going to be such a rise in Japan bashing," said Seika Kinoshita, a spokesman for SystemSoft. "We are expecting favorable sales," as many as 50,000 this year.

The game is played on a screen with images of fictional leaders of

the United States and Japan. The player is always the American, pitting himself against the computer, which plays the part of the Tokyo government.

As the game begins, the player chooses a degree and type of "bashing" from a selection on the screen, such as: "The Japanese government should stop driving whales into extinction," "Japanese

should make wheat their staple food," or "People who can't speak English are barbarians."

The more one bashes, the more the computer yields on trade demands, responding in the roundabout language typical of Japanese politicians. "We should concede on this issue in order not to leave tensions between the two nations."

At the same time, however, anti-American sentiment rises, jeopardizing overall relations.

For advanced players, the range of possible outcomes include a complete Japanese buyout of America and even war.

To show the player how well he is doing, a computer graphic shows a cowboy firing bullets at a samurai who flecks them away with his sword, indicating Japan is not giving in to U.S. demands.

If Japan concedes, the samurai gives up and falls over dead or, in the most extreme case, commits hara-kiri.

Meanwhile, tiny hamburgers dotting the North American continent slowly turn into sushi on the computer screen as Japan advances into the United States. Winged dollars flap out of the United States, while cars and computer chips roll in.

The better a player bashes Japan, the less sushi appears on the screen. Each game lasts two hours, representing a chronology from January 1980 to January 1992.

Was St. Patrick really a Londoner?

LONDON — On the eve of St. Patrick's Day, a British researcher has suggested that Ireland's patron saint was a Londoner from Battersea.

Like any other theory about Patrick, it is difficult to prove or refute because the 5th century apostle who brought Christianity to Ireland left only a hint about his origins.

"He left behind nothing about himself in hundreds of books," said Nicholas Fuentes, a retired bank of England official and independent archaeologist.

"But Patrick is always said to have lived in the 5th century somewhere along the western fringes of Britain, and to have been carried off by Irish marauders when he was 16 and

employed as a herdsman," Fuentes said.

"I'm saying it's a possibility that before he was captured he grew up on the eastern side of Britain, in Battersea," he said.

But, added Fuentes: "It's almost impossible to prove anything about the saint."

What we need is a rich fisherman to find some digging in the area for clues.

St. Patrick will be remembered in both parts of Ireland and by Irish-Americans here on March 17, his feast day.

Battersea is on the south bank of the Thames, about two miles upstream from Parliament. Densely populated Battersea was mainly built up in late Victorian times, and its main claim to contemporary fame is the Battersea Dogs' Home for manufarers when he was 16 and

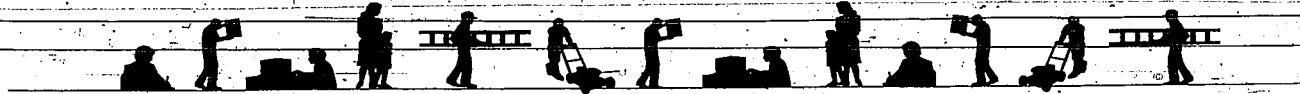

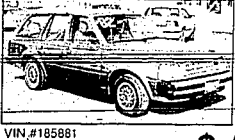

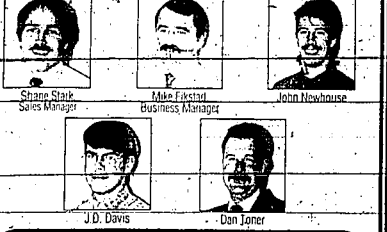

Patricia Wettig confronts her own fear by accepting lead in 'Taking Back My Life'

When Patricia Wettig first read the script of "Taking Back My Life" (airing Sunday, March 15, on CBS), she wanted to turn it down.

"It really scared me," says Wettig, who was alone in her house the night she read it. "I was spooked all night, and I decided not to do it."

But, as much as she may have liked to, Wettig found it hard to forget the real-life story of Nancy Ziegenmeyer, the Iowa woman who received national attention when she revealed her name and the details of her rape to the media.

"It kept coming back to me especially the character," says Wettig, who is best-known for playing Nancy Weston on "thirtysomething." "And I don't like not doing something because I'm afraid of it."

Confronting fear is the central issue of "Taking Back My Life." Nancy Ziegenmeyer's life changes the day she drives to a community college to take a real-estate exam. Before she can get out of her car, a stranger opens the passenger door, covers her face with a denim jacket and tapes her. He then takes her driver's license and photos of her children, telling her he will kill them if she goes to the police.

Ziegenmeyer does report the crime, then spends sleepless nights with her children at the foot of her bed, unable to close her eyes without reliving that horrible morning.

But fear is not the only thing with which Ziegenmeyer has to deal — she also must confront the judgment of her neighbors.

Because she had a reputation for being promiscuous, she originally tries to keep the rape a secret. "What happens when people say with a past like hers she deserves it?" she asks her husband, Steven (played by Stephen Lang).

Though her friends and family are largely supportive (with the exception of Ziegenmeyer's mother-in-law, Wilma, played by Ellen Burstyn), Ziegenmeyer is subjected to cruel remarks from strangers. "You've had all the men in town and now you go around picking them up off the street," a grocery clerk sneers.

The legal system also provides its share of frustrations. The prosecution's goal is to win the case and put the attacker behind bars. But the process often leaves Ziegenmeyer feeling further victimized — and very angry. "This is my case. You are my lawyer," she challenges court attorney Nan Horvath (played by Shelley Hack).

"I am not your lawyer," Horvath calmly informs her. "I represent the

people of this county. I'm a prosecutor." Horvath in turn is furious when Ziegenmeyer goes to the press. "You have no idea how hard everyone in this office has worked," Horvath says. "It takes skill and patience and not blowing a year's work because Nancy Ziegenmeyer needed attention."

The movie's refusal to limit the central characters to good and evil stereotypes, is its main strength. Similarly, the complexity of Ziegenmeyer's character is what ultimately attracted Wettig to the role.

"... You don't necessarily like (Nancy Ziegenmeyer) all the time," Wettig says. "But that's not really the point. It's not a matter of bad things happening to good people. Bad things happen to everybody."

Channel chatter

It's official. Jazz musician Branford Marsalis will replace Doc Severinsen as "The Tonight Show" music director when Jay Leno takes over from Johnny Carson in May, NBC announced Monday.

Leno said in December he was negotiating with Marsalis, 31, son of jazz pianist Ellis Marsalis and brother of trumpeter Wynton Marsalis.

Severinsen and announcer Ed McMahon will leave the show May 22 when Carson does; McMahon is being replaced by announcer Edd Hall.

Old TV favorites are dropping like flies. Latest casualties: ABC's "Growing Pains" and NBC's "Night Court." The 9-year-old "Night Court" is still doing OK in the ratings, ranking 41st out of 112 entries this season but NBC, according to programming chief Warren Littlefield, is "building for the future." Translation: The network is axing some of its veteran shows, which, the thinking goes, appeal to older viewers, who are less desirable to advertisers. It already has passed on "Matlock" (which is moving to ABC next fall) and "In the Heat of the Night" (which is moving to CBS as a series of movies). As for the 7-year-old "Growing Pains," it has fallen on hard times since ABC moved it in September from Tuesdays to Saturdays. It currently ranks 91st; last season it finished 27th. No word yet on possible new homes for either "Growing Pains" or "Night Court," which is taping its final episode Friday.

Is Burnett back? Despite the fact that CBS pulled the plug on Carol Burnett's new variety show in December after just six weeks, Burnett's Koala Productions will develop an unspecified number of series and movies for the network, says CBS Entertainment chief Jeff Sagansky. She may star in some of the shows.

Breaking the barriers. Turner Publishing and the Soviet news agency Tass will collaborate on a book about failed Soviet coup, according to CNN officials. The book of photos and text is tentatively titled, "Three Days That Shook the World: The Collapse of Communism in the Soviet Union." The title is a play on "Ten Days That Shook the World," the eyewitness account by American writer Julia Reed, who was in Moscow during the 1917 communist revolution. Turner Publishing and CNN are owned by Ted Turner.

WHAT'S NEW?

Ian Valentine, formerly an agent at International Creative Management, has joined ABC Productions as vice president for made-for-TV movies and miniseries.

Warner Wolf, 54, New York's top TV jock for 12 years at WCBS, will rejoin Washington's WUSA in June as lead sports anchor. He replaces Glenn Brenner, who died of a brain tumor Jan. 14. Wolf's five-year deal reportedly is worth \$1.1 million per, ironically, Brenner was Wolf's replacement at USA when he left for New York 16 years ago.

CBS News foreign editor Al Ortiz was named London bureau chief and vice president for Europe, a newly-created post.

His promotion is effective March 15. Ortiz, who joined CBS News in 1978, has been the network's foreign editor since March 1990, and helped direct CBS coverage of the Gulf War. As bureau chief in London, he will succeed Peter Bluff, who will join "60 Minutes" as a London-based producer. No one has been named yet to succeed Ortiz as foreign editor, a network spokesman said.

Cartoonless NBC adds 3 new shows

LOS ANGELES — Three shows aimed at teen-agers will be added this fall to NBC's cartoonless Saturday morning schedule, the network announced Friday.

NBC, which is completely overhauling its kiddie schedule, plans to begin a Saturday edition of the "Today" show Aug. 1 and the entire new Saturday schedule Sept. 12.

The newest entries are "Name Your Adventure," which will allow teen-agers to fulfill "their most exciting dreams"; "California Dreams," about a family with five teen-agers

who form a jock

band, and

"Double Date,"

which brings a

brother and sister together with three potential dates.

NBC announced in December it was scrapping animated Saturday programming — an intensely competitive market dominated by the Fox Broadcasting Co. and top-rated CBS — and would target teen audiences instead.

After a month's rest from the Wednesday night ABC schedule, "Dinosaurs" will return to the network on Fridays at 9 EST, starting March 20.

"Baby Talk" will slide to 9:30 that night as "Billy" takes a well-deserved nap (it ranked 61st among 123 network series as of last week).

Consumer affairs reporter Betty Furness has been dropped from the "Today" show after 16 years on the NBC program.

She will make her last appearance Wednesday, March 18, the same day she makes a farewell appearance on WNBC, the network flagship station in New York, where she has worked for 18 years.

Furness told reporters that "my contract was coming to an end and they called me in and said we're going to do a different approach to consumer reporting — more time out in the field, heavy investigation. They didn't feel I fitted that format and they, in effect, said, 'That's it!'"

For that matter, she said, "I didn't want to do it and I'm not up to it." She called the network move "a surprise," however.

"The Dennis Miller Show" wants to hear from viewers, both devoted and otherwise. Julia Duffy dabbled in daytime drama

Q: Was Julia Duffy of "Designing Women," ever on daytime's "The Edge of Night?" — I.M.

A: Although a soap opera veteran, Duffy was not on "The Edge of Night." Her daytime drama credits do include six months on "Love of Life" and four years on "The Doctors." After that she quickly became one of prime time's most active performers. She is now in her fourth series, CBS' "Designing Women." That follows "Wizards and Warriors" (she played Princess Ariel), "Newhart" (her most familiar role as the rich, snobby maid Stephanie) and in an early, short-lived incarnation of "Baby Talk." Duffy also has found time to appear in a PBS production of "Romeo and Juliet," on Broadway and in the films "Night Warning," "Battle Beyond the Stars" and "Cutter's Way."

Q: I watched satirist Mark Russell New Year's Eve on PBS but haven't seen him since. What's his schedule and will he be seen more because it's an election year? — K.S.

A: There will be no extra Mark Russell live specials this year beyond his usual six live broadcasts and two "best of" specials for PBS. The live programs are scheduled every two months with the next three set for April 22, June 17 and August 26. The two "best of" shows offered by Russell and his originating station, WNED-TV in Buffalo, include "The Mark Russell Songbook Special," highlights from the past four years, which aired earlier this month as part of PBS' fund-drive programming, and the traditional year-end "best of" broadcast, usually shown New Year's Eve.

Q: I recently saw Mason Adams in the film, "F-X." I know I've seen him in TV series over the years, but which ones? — C.S.

A: Adams, a major star on radio in the 1940s ("Pepper Young's Family"), has played character roles in many films ("The Final Conflict," "The Night They Saved Christmas," "The Revenge of the Stepford Wives," "A Shining Season") and has made countless guest appearances in television series. He became a familiar face to millions of viewers in 1977 when he portrayed managing editor Charley Hume on

Ed Asner's "Lou Grant." It ran five years ago, in 1986, Adams was seen on CBS' short-lived (three months) "Morningstar Eveningstar."

Q: Occasionally you have items about autograph collectors. I'm one and I wonder if anyone has asked you about switched photos. I've sent some really good and scarce ones to stars to sign and believe it or not have got an ordinary 8x10 glossy back instead of my prize picture! Has anyone else asked you about this? — K.E.

A: In the last year I've gotten a number of similar complaints. One disgruntled fan told of sending a dozen expensive studio portraits of a famous star and got back a single glossy with a rubber-stamped autograph. My only advice is not to let treasured photos out of your hands.

Q: We hear that veteran actor Sean Connery wants to run for president. Can that be true? — R.A.

A: Connery, a native of Scotland, is constitutionally ineligible to hold the office of U.S. president. That doesn't mean, however, that the 63-year-old ex-James Bond is without political ambitions. He tells me that after he finishes his tour to promote "Medicine Man," his latest movie, he'll be off to Scotland, Sean plans increase his involvement in the Scottish National Party, which is campaigning for Scottish independence from the British Empire.

NOT APPLE PIE: Luke Perry might be a shoo-in for the next "Sour Apple Award" from the Hollywood Women's Press Association. The "Beverly Hills 90210" actor was rude and uncooperative and didn't make any friends in the media at a recent Hollywood press function. Perry should reconsider his poor attitude when dealing with the very media that put him on dozens of magazine covers throughout the past year. The "Sour Apple" is awarded to those performers foolish enough to believe their own publicity.

Q: Isn't it odd that Jane Powell, who does those denture ads on TV, doesn't really have good false teeth? Mine, for example, are better looking than my real teeth ever were. This may be too trivial for you to answer but we always comment on it when we see the commercial. —

L.A.

A: The reason it seems odd is that Jane doesn't have false teeth and has never even had her teeth straightened, which is the reason they're not as perfect-looking as dentures.

Q: Isn't it true that John Forsythe was so disgusted with the "Dynasty" TV series at its end that he's vowed never to act on TV again? — J.L.

A: Forsythe loved his role on the "Dynasty" series, although as one who has experienced heart problems he wasn't crazy about the long working hours. Forsythe remains a sought-after personality, and has plans for many TV appearances because he's the star of an upcoming series, "The Powers That Be." John plays a senator with an illegitimate daughter, another who's anorexic, a power-hungry wife and a suicidal son-in-law who also happens to be a congressman. And, John tells me, the new show is a comedy.

Q: Are there any more singers at home in the Judd household who might step in now that Naomi Judd has retired and Wynona is doing a solo act? — T.P.

A: There is another beautiful young Judd at home but she is not interested in pursuing a singing career. Actually, she is no longer at home but Ashley, 23, is an actress who is currently enjoying her role as Swoosie Kurtz's rebellious daughter on the NBC show "Sisters." She was also seen in the NBC thriller "Till Death Do Us Part" and will soon begin filming a theatrical feature "Ruby in Paradise."

Q: A few years ago I read a profile of Brooke Shields where the writer described her as being terribly prim and proper. Is she still that way or maybe the writer had her figured wrong? — W.J.

A: No, the interviewer was quite right. Shields was extremely standoffish in public and private. Perhaps this was at the insistence of her mother, Brooks, now heading toward her 27th birthday, is a different young woman — much more relaxed and fun loving.

Portraying AIDS patient, Ringwald hopes others will find 'Something to Live For'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Although "nerve-racking," Molly Ringwald says her portrayal of real-life AIDS patient Allison Gertz in ABC's "Something to Live For" fulfilled a personal need to combat the deadly disease.

"I'd been wanting to do something to help in the fight against AIDS, but I didn't know what to do," she said. "I didn't think I would be very good at raising funds, since Madonna and Elizabeth Taylor are doing a terrific job. I wanted to do something to increase public awareness."

The movie, scheduled for next Sunday, tells the story of a young artist who contracted AIDS as a teen-ager in her first sexual encounter with a boyfriend.

"When this script came along I knew this was it. It shows that AIDS is not just a gay problem and is spreading rapidly among heterosexuals," Miss Ringwald said. "Young people are very vulnerable because they're experimenting sexually, yet often feel it can't affect them."

The actress sought to learn all she could about Miss Gertz during a brief meeting with her before filming began.

"I pretty much wanted to get a fix on what this girl was all about," Miss Ringwald said. "I wanted to see how she talked; how she dressed; what her apartment was like. I'd never played a real person before."

"Then when I started to play her I let it all go. I'm not an impersonator. No matter how good an actress I am I couldn't be her completely. Ali understood and supported that. The way I looked at it she could be any girl. She could be me...."

"But I did feel a special responsibility. It was nerve-racking."

"Something To Live For" also stars Lee Grant and Martin Landau as the parents, Perry King as the boyfriend and Roxana Zal as a friend, Tom McLoughlin directed from a screenplay by Deborah Joy Le Vine.

Miss Gertz was infected at the age of 16, but did not become aware of the illness until she was 22.

Now 26 and living in New York City, Miss Gertz was the subject of a film distributed by the World Health Organization and has established a foundation called Love Heals. When she is feeling well enough, the artist lectures at high schools and colleges.

Miss Ringwald became interested in the story when Miss Gertz's diaries were submitted to a production company the actress had at Columbia Pictures. She didn't pursue it at the time, but when a script for the current movie was sent to her, she accepted.

Miss Ringwald wanted the movie to show all of Miss Gertz's moods and colors, from depressed and angry to very positive.

"We did one scene where we tried to emphasize safe sex yet be romantic," she said. "We used two condoms. I think it's important to show condoms in a romantic scene."

Miss Ringwald has worked primarily in feature films such as "Sixteen Candles," "The Breakfast Club," "Pretty in Pink," "Fresh Horses" and "Betsy's Wedding." She has appeared in two other television movies, "Packin' It In" and "Surviving."

The actress began her performing career at age 9 with a role as an orphan child in the Los Angeles stage production of "Annie."

"I was singled out to audition for the role of the featured orphan," she said. "I was embarrassed at being singled out and said I didn't know how to tap dance."

After leaving "Annie" at the age of 12, she was in the original cast of TV's "Facts of Life," but the producers dropped her after about nine episodes.

"That was the luckiest thing that ever happened to me, although I didn't think so at the time," she said. "I don't want to commit that much time to one project. But I've always said I won't turn down anything out of hand that's really good."

Perhaps inspired by the fact that her boyfriend is novelist and screenwriter Mark Lindquist, Miss Ringwald has taken up writing. They wrote a screenplay together and she has written a number of short stories.

"My short stories are for me," she said. "They're too personal for me to think about publishing now. Besides, I think it's weird when celebrities publish a book. People read your book for all the wrong reasons."

The screenplay they wrote is a romantic comedy with a part in it for her.

"I absolutely wrote a part for me," she said. "I think of myself in all the roles. Every time I read a script the characters are so boring. I wanted to write a screenplay where I liked all the roles."
