# Noriega guilty on 8 of 10 charges

MIAMI — Manuel Noriega, former leader of Panama and ally of the United States, was convicted Thursday on eight of 10 counts of a drug trafficking and racketeering indictment that grew into what the government called "the trial of the century."

"The good guys won, and the bad guys lost," said Tom Cash, special agent in charge at the Drug Enforcement Administration in Miami. His agents spearheaded an unprecedented international investigation that documented a massive drug-smuggling operation spanning two hemispheres.

"Obviously that was not an accident," Cash said. "The jury has spoken, and that's the best definition that justice has been done."

Noriega, who faces up to 120 years in prison, will be sentenced July 10 by U.S. District Judge William Hoevener. After that, he will stand trial in Tampa on federal marijuana trafficking charges, prosecutors said.

"Noriega's attorneys, embittered by the verdict, vowed to appeal. It was a political trial all the way, said Miami lawyer Frank

Rubino, who led the defense effort. "This is the modern-day version of the Crusades," Rubino angrily told dozens of reporters gathered outside the federal courthouse in downtown Miami. "It's now clear we are the world's policeman and we dictate policy for the rest of the world."

He said Noriega, who sat impassively as the verdicts were announced, had no comment. In Washington, the president who brought about Noriega's downfall by sending 23,000 troops to Panama to topple the dictator's regime called the conviction a "major victory against the drug lords."

The verdict ended a long and often tedious courtroom saga. The government called more than 60 witnesses, many of them from an international rogues' gallery of drug traffickers and money launderers.

In the end, after a last-minute hitch that saw the jury temporarily deadlocked, the nine-woman, three-man panel concluded that the criminals on the stand had told the truth about the man at the defense table.

# Drought may drive ranchers out of South Hills early this summer

TWIN FALLS — Like the Magic Valley's farmers planning for a low winter year, ranchers who graze their cattle on public land in the South Hills are facing a dry summer — and perhaps a short grazing season.

"Water is going to be a real problem," said Don Oman, Twin Falls District Ranger of the Sawtooth National Forest. "If we don't get some rains to make the grass grow, we may not have a full season, Oman told a group of ranchers Thursday.

"The check's in the mail, and the rain's coming," Kimberly rancher Bill Brockman prophesied.

Though the Forest Service normally bills grazing permittees in April, Brockman asked for a little more time this year. If the drought continues, there may not be enough grass for as many cows as usual.

He said he'd hate to sell off a bunch of cattle and then have it start raining. The Forest Service can wait for its money, Range Conservationist Ralph Jenkins said. But ranchers still have to pay before they can turn their livestock loose on the federal land, he added.

The drought may also change the way grazing pastures are used this year.

Jenkins said he'd like to see fewer cattle on the normal spring pasture this year.

Those cows may go onto different pastures, but it's too soon to tell which pastures. Ranchers will meet with Jenkins later to see what water and grass is available where. Pastures are normally grazed in rotation, so that every few years each pasture is rested. Some pastures are better grazed at certain times of the year

# Hagerman recall bid commences

Petition targets mayor, charges inefficiency in administering city

HAGERMAN — A petition to recall Mayor Jim Martin was filed in Hagerman Thursday, saying the newly elected mayor has been unable to effectively run the city.

The petition, filed by resident Sandy Petronek, stated Martin should be removed from office because "he has not run the city in the best interest of the citizens of the city... and several departments have not been able to function effectively since Martin took office in the manner they should."

A recall means registered voters will cast ballots in another election on whether they want Martin to be mayor.

Petronek declined to elaborate on the charges Thursday evening or say which city officials resigned because of dissatisfaction with the mayor.

Earlier in the week, the police chief, a councilman, several reserve police officers, the dog catcher and city clerk all turned in their resignations to the city.

Petronek charged that Martin makes decisions without council approval, but declined to cite specific incidents.

"It's more like a dictator than a mayor," she said.

Martin countered he does not make decisions on his own, and the majority of the city residents support him.

He added the petition carries the signatures of 23 people who all bear grudges against the city for various reasons.

He said some are mad because they were not appointed or elected to city offices; some are disgruntled because they have lost their power, and one is "a town crier" who is against everything.

"They can't get their way anymore, so they're just being a bunch of cry babies," Martin said. "Ninety-five percent of the people in town are excellent. Everyone's cooperating except this certain group."

# IRS says foreign firms pay no taxes

WASHINGTON — Foreign-owned businesses operating in the United States may be illegally dodging income taxes worth up to \$30 billion a year, and many pay no tax at all on billions of dollars of sales, a House panel was told Thursday.

The Internal Revenue Service acknowledged there is a compliance problem among many foreign companies, but Commissioner Shirley D. Peterson said there is not nearly enough information available to estimate the loss. She suggested the maximum loss would be about \$3 billion a year.

Seventeen foreign companies that distribute cars in this country paid the United States an average \$4 in tax for each \$1,000 of sales over several years, according to an investigation by the staff of the House Ways and Means oversight subcommittee. One company sold \$3.4 billion worth of cars over two years and paid zero tax.

# Judge lets burglary victims strike back

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — A judge who allows burglary victims to go to the thief's home and snatch his favorite possessions says unconventional sentences can get a lawbreaker's attention in a big way.

"He learns what a good citizen feels like, worrying whether he's going to come home and find all his stuff still there," said Criminal Court Judge Joe B. Brown.

Since his election two years ago, Brown has built a reputation as a tough, street-wise judge willing to try new things in sentencing criminals.

He has ordered several burglars to open their homes to former victims. With deputies in tow, they can take

what they want, up to a limit set by Brown that approximates the value of what they lost.

One victim made several visits before he was satisfied.

"The first day he didn't find anything, but the second time he came back, he bagged a color television and a stereo-component set," the 44-year-old judge said in an interview Wednesday.

The sentences have raised eyebrows around the Memphis courthouse, but have drawn few serious complaints from defense lawyers.

"He's been very creative," said Robert Jones, assistant administrator of the Shelby County public defender's office. "But a lot of things that have been done in the

past aren't working, so somebody needs to be creative."

Most of the lawbreakers brought before Brown are young, poor and uneducated. Clashes with authority often mean little but losing their personal possessions can hurt.

Brown said he knows of three burglary victims who have taken advantage of his take-back offer. Several others have permission but are biding their time.

He said the offer helps victims get over their anger. He went along himself with two. "They come out smiling. They felt better," he said.

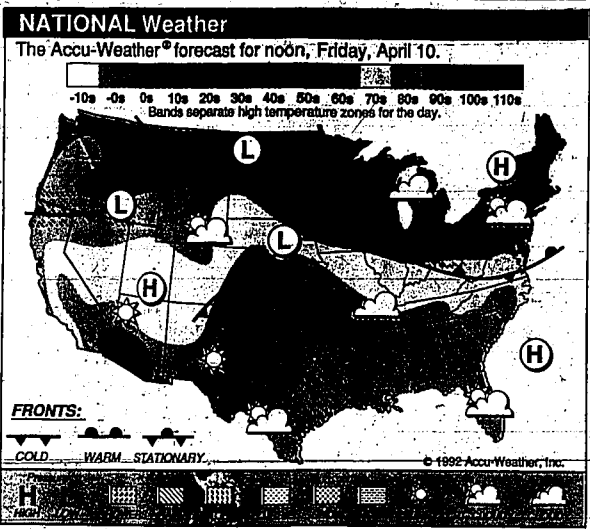
It may be difficult to tell, however, if items seized by a victim really belong to the burglar, said Scott Wallace of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers.

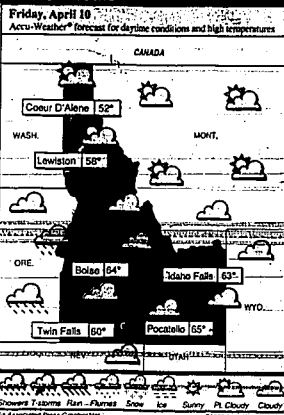

## Thunderstorms pound Missouri with large hailstones

Over the weekend, at an unprecedented press conference, the judge acknowledged that the prosecution's use of plea bargains was also on trial.

But Thursday, Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael Sullivan, who led a five-man prosecution team, defended the government's strategy of using low-ranking traffickers to convict their bosses.

The jurors who convicted Noriega said Thursday they were tired but believed that their seven-month ordeal was over. They said their verdict was "difficult" and "heavily debated" but refused to say how they arrived at it.

Minutes after the verdict, they assembled in a 13th-floor suite of rooms at downtown's Everglades Hotel, their home for the past week, and switched on the news. Impassively, they watched as word of their historic decision dribbled out to the world.

Noriega's guilty on eight of 10 counts. But no one could explain what great debates, what key pieces of evidence, led the jury to conclude that Panama's one-time strongman also had been a drug smuggler.

The answers would have to wait. Eight jurors held an afternoon press conference that lasted just long enough for them to deliver collective "No comment" and plead with the media to leave them alone for the night.

"It's been a long seven months, we've examined all the evidence, and the verdict we reached speaks for itself," said juror Jim Hogan, reading from a sheet of paper where his fellow jurors had scribbled the jury's message. "We would ask that the

**THE VERDICT:** How the jury voted on the 10 charges against Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega:

**COUNT ONE (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega conspired with the Medellin cocaine cartel by accepting millions of dollars in bribes in exchange for protecting cartel drug traffickers and money launderers and allowing them to operate in Panama from 1982 to 1986. PENALTY: 20 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT TWO (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega helped the Medellin cartel specifically by protecting a clandestine cocaine laboratory in Panama, either shipments through Panama to cocaine laboratories in Colombia, from Colombia to the United States via Panama, and flights of drug profits from the United States to Panama. PENALTY: 20 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT THREE (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega conspired to distribute cocaine by protecting flights of cocaine to the United States via Panama. PENALTY: 15 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT FOUR (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega helped distribute 400 kilos of cocaine in May 1983 through his protection of a cocaine flight from Colombia to Panama. PENALTY: 15 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT FIVE (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega helped distribute 400 kilos of cocaine in Jan. 1984 through his protection of a cocaine flight from Colombia to Panama. PENALTY: 15 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT SIX (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega helped the cartel manufacture cocaine in its laboratories in Colombia by providing the cartel with a cocaine flight from Panama to Colombia. PENALTY: 15 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT SEVEN (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega conspired to manufacture cocaine through his protection of a clandestine cocaine laboratory in Panama. PENALTY: 15 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT EIGHT (NOT GUILTY):** Charges Noriega conspired to smuggle 322 kilos of cocaine into the United States on the yacht Krill in March 1986. PENALTY: 20 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT NINE (NOT GUILTY):** Charges Noriega helped the Krill smuggling venture. PENALTY: 20 years and \$250,000.

**COUNT TEN (GUILTY):** Charges Noriega with involvement in the May 1983 flight of \$800,000 in drug proceeds from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., to Panama. PENALTY: 5 years and \$10,000.

media and the press respect our privacy and appreciate our decision to reserve our comments to a further date."

Refusing to take questions, the jurors, escorted by U.S. marshals, then strode through the hotel kitchen to a waiting elevator. It took them back to their rooms, where some

Noriega, 58, was indicted Feb. 4, 1988, along with 15 other people, including Pablo Escobar, head of the notorious Medellin cocaine cartel in Colombia. At the time, Noriega ran Panama with an "iron fist."

than others.

"It's better to get in the cattle in June than get out in the summer," says Jim Prunty, a former Forest Service employee, who complained that the scenic corridor along the Rogerson Road from Deadline Ridge to the forest boundaries was not meeting the direction outlined in the 1987 forest plan.

"The Sawtooth National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan says that unsightly, overgrazed areas are more important than grazing along such scenic corridors. Prunty pointed out.

The area along the road shows

signs of heavy grazing, including creek banks and beaver ponds damaged by livestock trampling. Forest managers have been slow to act, Prunty says.

"We don't have much ability to do anything to change that," Oman said. He acknowledged the grazing damage, but said careful herding can help relieve the heavy use along the creek, he said.

According to the forest plan, guidelines and standards for a variety of uses must be met by 1997. Prunty charges that the area does not meet the plan's guidelines.

New grazing management plans, now in the works, for the area would resolve the issue, Jenkins said.

### Baker backs aid to Russia, republics

WASHINGTON — Secretary of State James A. Baker III challenged Congress Thursday to pass an aid package for Russia by the time Boris Yeltsin visits in June, as President Bush's proposal for helping the former Soviet republics got its first critical scrutiny.

Baker appealed to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to pass the aid proposal, saying "I do not think we have any more pressing national security imperatives."

But Baker conceded that even without congressional action, the administration has the authority to do most of what it wants. And he offered vague and general answers when senators asked how much the package would cost U.S. taxpayers.

### Federal Reserve lowers interest rate

WASHINGTON — The Federal Reserve on Thursday unexpectedly lowered a key interest rate in a move apparently aimed at calming jittery financial markets and boosting recovery insurance for the U.S. economy.

The Fed added reserves to the nation's money supply shortly before noon in a fashion that economists said clearly signalled a cut in its target for the federal funds rate, the interest that banks charge each other.

Most economists said they believed the Fed had cut the funds rate by a quarter-point, from 4 percent to 3.75 percent. The Fed's move Thursday was taken against a backdrop of these economic developments:

- The 0.2 percent gain in the Labor Department's Producer Price Index, which measures inflation pressures before they reach consumers, matched the small February increase and left wholesale prices rising at an annual rate this year of 0.7 percent.

- Many of the nation's largest retailers reported that sales were down last month, but analysts discounted much of the weakness, saying it came from unusually cold weather and the late Easter.

- The number of Americans filing first-time claims for unemployment benefits dropped by 24,000 for the last week in March.

- Businesses plan to boost spending on new plants and equipment by 4.6 percent this year.

### House panel restores submarine funds

WASHINGTON — A House subcommittee Thursday approved the restoration of funding for the Seawolf attack submarine.

The action by the House defense appropriations subcommittee would reverse part of a budget proposal by President Bush to eliminate funding for two Seawolfs that had been approved in previous years by Congress.

The first in the new line of Seawolf attack submarines is under construction at the Electric Boat Division of General Dynamics Corp. in Groton, Conn. Under Bush's plan, it would be the only Seawolf built.

### IRS sets record for loan confiscations

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service confiscated a record \$371.1 million in tax refund payments last year from people who had failed to repay federal student loans, the Education Department said Thursday.

The money was collected from 575,578 taxpayers through the IRS Tax Refund Offset Program and accounted for almost half of the more than \$800 million in defaulted loans collected last year.

The average amount held back was \$644.76 per person, and that has climbed to \$836.63 for confiscated refunds so far this year.

### SEC charges illegal insider trading

WASHINGTON — The Securities and Exchange Commission Thursday accused three former Treasury Department employees and the manager of a diner of illegal insider trading that earned them about \$175,000.

The charges are contained in a civil suit the SEC filed in U.S. District Court against John Acree, 43; John Flattery, 41; Stephen Lane, 39; and Robert Bolton Jr., 35.

The SEC does not have the authority to file criminal charges, said SEC attorney Jonathan T. Golomb.

## FDA will hasten OK of new AIDS drugs

WASHINGTON (AP) — The administration said Thursday it's cutting the time it takes to get new "breakthrough" drugs out of the lab and into the hands of the seriously ill.

The new policy announced by the Food and Drug Administration is targeted mainly at drugs and treatments that show promise in dealing with AIDS.

"This is the most serious package of FDA reforms in a generation," said Vice President Dan Quayle, whose Competitiveness Council recommended the changes last November.

"We eventually want to open it up for all diseases," Quayle said.

"We're talking about compassion and we're talking about something that will save lots of lives," said President Bush, posing for pictures in the Oval Office with FDA Commissioner David Kessler, Health and Human Services Secretary Louis W. Sullivan and Quayle.

Bush strongly defended the speedup: "He said the disgraces with those bureaucrats up there from Capitol Hill and some of these special pleaders that are against everything you do ... in trying to move drugs out."

Members of Congress have said that Quayle and the White House had been trying to strong-arm a reluctant FDA into accepting its provisions for changing the methods of drug approval.

The new policy would widen the availability of experimental therapies for AIDS and HIV-related ill-

nesses, according to a fact sheet by the Health and Human Services Department.

This means these therapies will be available to people who need them and not just to those individuals accepted for tightly controlled clinical trials.

The department released only summaries of what was being put into effect, leaving out details that had raised concerns earlier on Capitol Hill. Detailed regulations are to be published later in the Federal Register.

The experimental drugs would be approved for distribution if the FDA thinks they are "reasonably safe" and show "promising evidence" of effectiveness, the department said.

The Public Health Service also is ready to set up a similar program for people with other life-threatening diseases.

"These actions will save both lives and money and reduce human suffering," Sullivan said.

Quayle repeated his claim that the actions will save "millions of lives" and "billions of dollars."

But internal FDA documents showed that officials within the agency could find no basis for that assertion.

Kessler, asked about Quayle's figures at Thursday's news conference, would not dispute them, but also would not repeat them.

### Senate rejects Democratic plan to lower Bush's defense budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate narrowly rejected a Democratic effort Thursday to slash \$2.2 billion from President Bush's proposed \$292-billion defense budget for next year.

The 50-45 defeat was merely the latest in a string of setbacks for Democrats eager to pry money out of the Pentagon's coffers.

The vote came as lawmakers struggled over a fiscal 1993 budget of \$1.5 trillion, the first spending

blueprint they have written since the Soviet Union's breakup.

Even though they boast a 57-43 majority in the Senate, Democrats hunted in vain for votes for their attempt to whittle down Bush's plan by less than 2 percent.

The sponsor of the effort, Sen. J. James Exon, D-Nebr., predicted in advance that he would lose because of the influence of the military-industrial complex, which is still alive

and well.

### Improved TV system planned

WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal regulators approved a framework Thursday that would bring to American homes by 1998 a new generation of television with clearer, brighter images and sharper sound.

The regulatory framework would give existing television stations a second channel temporarily and up to five years in which to begin broadcasting high-definition television after a transmission standard is adopted.

The Federal Communications Commission hopes to set a standard in mid-to-late 1993, or at least by early 1994.

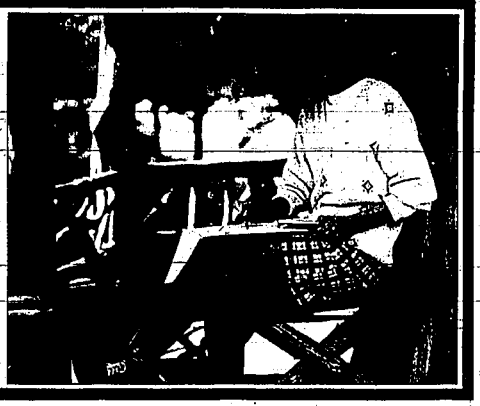
With the second channel, a TV station could broadcast its current signal and another one in the HDTV mode. That way consumers would be able to watch the station whether they had an HDTV set or an old one.

**Libyans protest sanctions**

TRIPOLI, Libya (AP) — Hundreds of Libyans and other Arabs denounced Western nations Thursday in the third big rally in a week to protest punitive U.N. sanctions in connection with the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103.

The peaceful gathering of about 1,500 protesters in Tripoli's main square was in sharp contrast to the violent attacks by Libyan students a week earlier on embassies of nations that voted to impose arms and air embargoes on Libya.

The U.N. Security Council says the sanctions will take effect on Wednesday unless Libya surrenders two alleged intelligence agents for trial in the 1988 bombing of a Pan Am jet over Lockerbie, Scotland. The attack killed 270 people.

Libya has denied any involvement in the incident and has appealed to the World Court, the U.N. judicial arm in The Hague, Netherlands, to block the sanctions.

Officials at the court announced Thursday that it would rule on Libya's appeal Tuesday. The court has no enforcement powers, and its rulings are subject to voluntary compliance.

In Geneva, meanwhile, a U.N. special envoy, Vladimir Petrovsky, briefed Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali on his meeting two days earlier with Libyan leader Moammar Gadhafi.

**Republics call truce in dispute regarding fleet**

KIEV, Ukraine (AP) — Russia and Ukraine called a truce Thursday in a war of words over the Black Sea fleet, suspending competing decrees claiming control of its warships and forming a commission to settle the fight.

The agreement was an important step toward resolving the conflict, which has seriously strained Russian-Ukrainian relations and threatened the unity of the Commonwealth of Independent States. Many of the former Soviet republics are setting up their own military forces.

The truce was reached during two telephone conversations between Russian President Boris Yeltsin and Ukrainian President Leonid Kravchuk.

"If we have enough wisdom, calm, and leave ambitions aside, we will be able to resolve this issue in the interests of our states and peoples," Kravchuk said on commonwealth television. "Peoples don't want to quarrel with each other, and we should be wise enough" to avoid quarrels.

Both presidents agreed to suspend decrees they issued earlier.

**Yasser Arafat leaves hospital**

TRIPOLI, Libya (AP) — The PLO leadership decided Thursday to postpone a key meeting on participation in the Middle East peace talks until Yasser Arafat recovers from injuries suffered in a plane crash in the Libyan desert.

The 62-year-old PLO chief flew to Tripoli on Thursday, a day after he was rescued and taken to a hospital in Misratah, 120 miles east of the Libyan capital, the official Libyan news agency said.

PLO sources in Tunis said Arafat could not walk on his own. The officials, speaking on condition of anonymity, said he apparently broke a leg and maybe a hand when the plane crashed.

**N. Korea OKs pact**

TOKYO (AP) — North Korea's parliament ratified an agreement on opening its nuclear facilities to outside inspection Thursday, but attached a condition that no other nation threaten it with atomic arms, official news media said.

The provision likely was aimed at the United States, which has supported South Korea since the Korean peninsula was divided into communist north and capitalist south in 1945.

**Serbs capture town**

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina (AP) — Serbian paramilitary forces crossed the Drina River and captured a Muslim town in newly independent Bosnia-Herzegovina, Sarajevo Radio reported Thursday. At least 10 people died in the battle.

The capture of the town of Zvornik means a chunk of northeastern Bosnia has been lost to Serbs opposing independence for the central republic.

## Forest loses money selling timber

TWIN FALLS — Timber sales in the Sawtooth National Forest ran six figures into the red last year.

According to the Forest Service, the SNF took in \$146,000, spent \$607,000 and paid the state \$23,388 — a total loss of \$484,766. The forest sold 7.59 million board feet of timber.

But by assigning dollar values to improvements in recreation and wildlife habitat, to increased water runoff and to other benefits, the forest figures it comes out ahead by about \$11,000 a year.

The cost-benefit accounting shows that "addition is becoming political," said Mike

Medberry, public lands coordinator with Idaho Conservation League.

According to Forest Service figures, logging conducted in 1991 will reduce deer habitat, and therefore deer hunting, for 15 years, for an estimated loss of about \$17,000.

But as trees and shrubs begin to grow back to provide browse and cover for deer, habitat — and hunting — will increase over the following 75 years for a benefit of \$28,759.

"Cutting trees to protect wildlife — let's see, I've gotta think about that for a while,"

Medberry said.

But the deficit is deceptive, said forester John Robateck. "If we didn't cut a stick of timber, we'd still have some of those expenses," he said.

It is difficult to assign a dollar value to many benefits and costs, Robateck said. And some things aren't included in the equation.

Fire protection, for example, wasn't included in the figures. But logging changes the fire situation in the forest by removing dead timber, he said.

The figures don't include effects on water quality, on non-game wildlife species or on scenic views.

Timber sales in the Sawtooth forest mostly consist of firewood, post and pole, house logs and a little commercial saw timber.

Medberry is skeptical of justifications for continued timber sales in the dry Sawtooth forest. The Forest Service seldom offers reasons for the things it asserts, he said.

"You have to take on faith what the Forest Service says," he said.

But it's obvious from the small amount of timber sales that timber in the Sawtooth is not worth much, Medberry said. The Forest Service cuts the best trees in prime habitat, but they won't grow back in much of the forest, he said.

### Jerome man suffers heart attack driving

JEROME — A 70-year-old Jerome man had a heart attack while driving and ran into a truck on Golf Course Road Thursday afternoon.

Melvin Crosby was reported in critical condition at the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center Thursday night.

Crosby was eastbound a quarter mile east of the Blue Lakes Country Club Road, and had passed several cars who pulled over to let him by, Idaho State Police dispatcher Dee Silver said.

At 12:15 p.m., Crosby's pickup hit a Range Rover truck in the left rear corner and went off the road, stopping about 200 yards off the road, Silver said. The driver of the truck was not injured.

Crosby apparently knew he was having a heart attack, which accounts for his high speeds, Silver said. When he hit the truck, Crosby fell over into his seat, but his foot remained on the gas pedal, she said.

The fire protection district includes rural Twin Falls County from 2600 East to 3300 East and from Idaho Highway 74 to the Snake River. The Twin Falls fire station is located at 345 Second Ave. E.

### State health officials still may not drink non-alcoholic beer

BOISE — If you aren't old enough to drink the real stuff, you aren't old enough to drink non-alcoholic beer, the state Alcohol Beverage Control Division says.

Many products that call themselves non-alcoholic, such as Coor's Cutter, O'Doul's and Sharp's, still contain about .05 percent alcohol and are considered beer by the state, said Keith Mathews, assistant director of the Idaho Department of Law Enforcement.

Nobody under 21 can legally drink these so-called non-alcoholic brews, and retailers can't sell them to minors, Mathews said.

According to Idaho law, nobody younger than 19 can sell or dispense alcoholic beverages.

### Meeting on opposing landfill near Hansen set Saturday

HANSEN — Hansen-area residents who want to appeal the decision that granted a conditional-use permit for a regional landfill will meet Saturday.

The meeting takes place at 5:30 p.m. in room 21 of Hansen High School, said Tony Barnes, who owns land near where the landfill is proposed to be built.

Barnes said those eligible to appeal the decision must have attended Tuesday night's meeting when the Twin Falls County Planning and Zoning Commission issued the conditional-use permit, or live within 300 feet of the proposed project, or have substantial information that might alter the conditions such as were presented during the hearing, or have signed the petition against the project that residents presented commission members at the hearing.

Six Magic Valley counties want to build a regional landfill on the east side of Hansen Butte, five miles east of Hansen. The land lies in the county agricultural zone, meaning the counties needed a conditional-use permit to build landfill.

The Twin Falls County Planning and Zoning Commission voted 5 to 3 Tuesday night to issue the permit. Those who want to appeal must file within 10 days of the decision. The Twin Falls County Commission will hear the appeal.

### State investigators place case of Baby X on temporary hold

BOISE — Attorney general investigators have put the Baby X case on hold for a couple of weeks, a spokesman said Thursday.

"We've put Baby X on hold, more or less, for the time being," said Russ Reneau, chief criminal investigator for Idaho Attorney General Larry Echohawk.

The man investigating the case has been diverted to another investigation for at least two weeks, Reneau said. "We've been waiting for a couple of things to happen but they haven't happened yet."

In a speech in Jerome last month, Echohawk said information on the death of the infant might be released soon. Reneau said Thursday that information would be released, but that he did not know when. Baby X was found near the Minidoka County landfill in October 1989. The infant had been mutilated, and speculation immediately arose that she died in a satanic ritual.

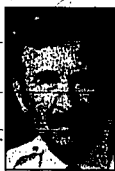
## Minidoka challenger seeks task force; current sheriff wants better 911 system

## Air Force likes INEL site for nuclear rocket program

IDAHO FALLS — The Air Force has three possible sites in mind for a nuclear rocket program, and two of them are located at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

Supporters of INEL showed up in force at a Thursday night hearing on the project's environmental impact statement to show their support for the program being sent to Idaho instead of a third possible location, the Federal Energy Department's Nevada Test Site.

The Nevada Test Site has many fine engineers and plenty of open space, "but

their whole purpose is to blow up things," said Jack Barraclough, a former U.S. Geological Survey hydrologist who now works for EG&G Idaho Inc., an INEL contractor.

Though public support in Idaho Falls is widespread, little is known about the Space Nuclear Thermal Propulsion Program.

The Air Force already has prepared an environmental impact statement. But since the project was until recently classified, that statement and the details of the project were kept secret.

Just as the Air Force was ready to make a final decision, Deputy Air Force

TWIN FALLS — A pioneer of broadcast journalism in the Magic Valley, Gordon Owen Glasmann, died Wednesday evening following a long illness.

Glasmann, 69, died at his home in Twin Falls. The funeral will be 11 a.m. Saturday at Reynolds Funeral Chapel in Twin Falls.

Friends remembered him Thursday as a charitable man who was well-liked by his workers and business associates.

"People liked working for him, and they liked him," said Charles Tuma, manager of KLIK Radio. "He definitely cared for the community." Glasmann came to Twin Falls in 1956 to

manage KLIK radio and TV stations. The radio station sold in 1965, but Glasmann managed the TV station, which became KMVT, until 1972.

After leaving KMVT, Glasmann started the Magic Valley Newspaper Group, which included the Wood River Journal, North Side News and Gooding County Leader. He sold the papers in 1988.

Twin Falls businessman John Roper, who knew Glasmann for 25 years, said he will be missed. "He was an excellent man, I thought very highly of him," Roper said. "He had a lot of friends, but was a very private man."

Glasmann raised money for and contributed to numerous causes and institutions, including the College of Southern Idaho Fine Arts Auditorium and the Southern Idaho Regional Cancer Center, Tuma and Roper said. "Anybody who had a charitable cause could tap him," Tuma said.

Glasmann and his wife, Joyce, contributed \$500,000 to the cancer center, Roper said.

Glasmann was born in Ogden, Utah, on April 1, 1923. He attended Ogden schools and the University of Utah and served in the Navy Underwater Demolition Team and Sea-Bees.

His family owned the Ogden Standard Examiner. He was a past state director of the National Cutting Horse Association. He is survived by his wife of Twin Falls.

# Hansen won't help with flooded basement

**HANSEN** - The city and its insurance company refused Thursday to authorize cleanup of a basement flooded with city sewage.

"We don't feel it's our responsibility," Mayor George Urie said.

The home of Jim and Sue Thomson at 480 Railroad St. was flooded for the second time in less than two months Wednesday when a nearby city sewer line clogged.

The line was unclogged later that day.

"But now that the water has receded, there's human (excrement) all over the place," Sue Thomson said Thursday afternoon.

Jim Thomson said Nu Life Contractors from Twin Falls arrived Thursday morning to clean the basement, but neither the city's insurance company and its adjutor nor city officials would give the go-ahead.

Urie said the city does not consider Wednesday's flooding its fault, and referred further questions to the insurance company, ITT/Hartford.

The company said Wednesday it will not discuss pending claims.

Bob Wageman, an insurance adjuster handling the case, was not available for comment Thursday.

After the February flood, Urie said damage may not have occurred had the Thomsons'

plumbing been equipped with a back-flow valve. Nevertheless, the city told the Thomsons its insurance company would pay for damage to the home.

Jim Thomson said he received an offer of \$17,000 on Wednesday from ITT/Hartford, the city's liability insurance carrier.

He said the company termed the amount its "final" offer. Earlier, the company had offered a \$10,000 settlement, which the Thomsons rejected.

Following the first flood, the Thomsons received an estimate for damage repairs alone totaling \$7,231. Jim Thomson says \$12,000 will not be enough to pay for cleaning, repairs and the family's lost belongings.

In addition, the family can't fathom why city officials have not shown much concern or compassion about the repeated flooding.

"I don't understand why the mayor doesn't at least come look," Sue Thomson said.

Meanwhile, Jim Thomson wonders how the city will find out about sewer clogs once his family installs the back-flow valve.

"What will be their warning system when our basement doesn't flood?" he asked.

The Thomsons also are trying to figure out how they'll clean their basement if the city holds steadfast on its refusal to pay.

"We may just have to get a hold of our friends, call the EPA and find out how to go about it," Sue Thomson said.

# Jerome begins laying pipe for cheese plant

**JEROME** - The city of Jerome has begun laying sewer pipe for a new cheese plant to be constructed south of Jerome.

"The city crews are doing an outstanding job," consulting engineer Scott Bybee told the City Council Tuesday. "The line is two-thirds complete, and we know the city a pat on the back." The mile and a half pipeline will be completed by mid-January, Bybee said.

Should the cheese plant start sending up to 350,000 gallons of waste products per day "the treatment plant could handle the load right now, but it would take them to the limit," Bybee said.

The council approved a revised agreement with the cheese firm for treating wastewater generated by the cheese processing.

The agreement set a maximum temperature of 140 degrees that can come from the plant at a sewer lift station south of Jerome.

The sewage will travel 61 minutes before reaching the city treatment plant, Bybee said.

"This should be plenty of time for it (waste) to cool," he said. Temperatures in excess of the specified amount could kill bacteria needed in treating the wastes, he said.

## Buhl decides on cool school

**BUHL** - The Buhl School Board opted for the low bid of \$21,613 to replace the cooling system at the high school this week. Three bids were submitted at a meeting held Wednesday evening.

The companies placing bids included ones from Salt Lake, Boise and Twin Falls. The low bid was from Clima-Tech out of Boise, and the bid includes improvements that the old system didn't have.

The Baltimore-brand cooling system costs \$18,047. For \$2,526, insulation and winterization will be included, and an additional \$1,040 will cover dampers.

The old cooling system is no longer operational, but the new one won't be installed before school is out for the year. It will take four to six weeks for the equipment to arrive and another 60 days to complete installation.

Funds to cover the new cooling system will come out of the plant facilities fund.

## Court rules against Blaine developer

**BOISE (AP)** - A developer is prevented by the original plan for a Blaine County subdivision from constructing houses in a "common area," the Idaho Supreme Court says. The court on Wednesday upheld a lower court ruling in favor of Chris Haugh and against Robert Smelick, who purchased the Weykain Ranch development in 1988.

The Supreme Court majority said it was clear that a plan filed in 1980 for the development near Ketchum called for a common area to be left open. Justice Byron Johnson dissented. He said by the time Haugh purchased her lots in 1986 and 1987, replans for Weykain Ranch showed additional development in the area.

## NHL season still alive as talks continue

**NEW YORK** — The talks are back on and the NHL season isn't off — yet.

The NHL reopened talks with the striking players' union Thursday in an attempt to save the Stanley Cup playoffs. In doing so, the league allowed its season-ending deadline to pass.

A spokesman for the NHL Players Association said that executive director Bob Goodenow was on his way to New

York to meet with NHL President John Ziegler on Friday.

It will be the first time they have talked since Tuesday when the owners gave the players a take-it-or-leave-it contract offer. The owners set a 3 p.m. EDT deadline for Thursday to respond or they would cancel the remainder of the season and the playoffs.

The players immediately rejected the offer and the owners left it on the table until the last minute. Finally, the NHL let

the deadline pass with just a short statement from Ziegler.

"I'm obliged to report that the NHL's final offer was not accepted by the NHLPA upon expiration of the date and time established for its acceptance, (Thursday) 3 p.m., EDT," Ziegler said.

Ziegler added that the owners' offer was taken off the table. The players did the same thing with their final offer earlier in the week.

Ziegler set the deadline so that if the

players accepted the owners' offer, they could report to their teams by Friday and resume the season by Sunday.

"All but 30 of the season's games were played while the NHLPA called the first league-wide hockey strike in history on April 1, in the midst of the NHL's 75th anniversary season.

After spending 3 1/2 hours on a conference call with the board of governors on Thursday, Ziegler said that he has also had been in touch with Goodenow by phone.

## Masters: It's Wadkins, Sluman

**AUGUSTA, Ga.** — Out there on the far edge of the property, down in the little valley formed by Rae's Creek, is Amen Corner, the 11th, 12th and 13th holes of the Augusta National Golf Club.

Together, they make up one of the most intimidating stretches in the world of golf. Lanny Wadkins birdied them all.

He was due.

"Amen Corner's kicked my butt so many times over the years, it probably owes me some," Wadkins said Thursday after he came around the turn with the momentum that propelled him to a 7-under-par 65 in the first round of the Masters.

But the 41-year-old veteran was not alone in his conquest of a course that was completely out of character: strangely yielding, unusually forgiving in the absence of wind.

Jeff Sluman, for example, hit a 4-iron 213-yards and into the cup for a hole-in-one on the par-3 fourth, the only ace ever recorded on that hole after an estimated 11,000 tee shots in 56 years of Masters competition.

That put the 5-foot-7, 140-pound Sluman 4-under for four holes and sent him on a par 65 and a hole-in-one, three strokes ahead of Players Championship winner David Love III, former PGA champ Wayne Grady, Mike Hulbert and Ted Schulz.

"The opportunity was there to shoot a good score if you put it in the right place," Sluman said after his bogey-free effort.

"A perfect day," Wadkins agreed. "The golf course was there for the taking," said Jack Nicklaus, seeking a seventh-Masters title at age 52.

And take it they did. Nicklaus was among 18 players who shot in the 60s, a tournament record for the first round. The old record was 12.

Fred Couples, the outstanding player in the world over the last 10 months, defending champion Ian Woosnam of Wales and 49-year-old Ray Floyd also were in that group, but some of the game's great stars were far, far back.

"Spanish stars Jose Maria Olazabal and Seve Ballesteros were among those in danger of missing the cut when the field is trimmed to the low 44 scores and all within 10 shots of the lead after 36 holes. Olazabal struggled to a 76 and Ballesteros, a 75.

Chip Beck, winner last week at New Orleans, double-bogeyed the first two holes on the back and finished at 76, one behind Masters legend Arnold Palmer.

## Becker an early casualty in Barcelona

**BARCELONA, Spain** — It happens every spring: Boris Becker turns to putty when he ventures on to clay.

Becker has five Grand Slam titles on grass and hard courts but never wins anything on clay. He lost on the slow surface at the Conde de Godo tournament Thursday to 230th-ranked Jordi Burillo, playing in only his second ATP event.

"I still don't know how I managed to win against Becker," said Burillo, who has tried to pattern his game after the German by relying on a powerful serve and aggressive

play. "Now I think it's possible to win against anyone."

The 1-6, 7-6, 6-4 defeat was Becker's first tournament singles match on clay, since the semifinals of the French Open last June.

"It is difficult for the top players arriving from a hard-court season to adjust quickly to clay," said Becker. "We were playing in Key Biscayne (on hard courts) and had no time to practice on clay."

Second seed Ivan Lendl, fifth seed Sergi Bruguera, seventh seed Alberto Mancini, eighth seed Magnus Gustafsson and 16th seed Horst Skoff all advanced to the

quarterfinals Thursday.

Lendl served 12 aces as he defeated 15th seed Thomas Muster 6-3, 6-4, and Mancini ousted ninth seed Francisco Clavet 7-6 (7-4), 6-0.

Two other seeds lost. Jordi Arrese, seeded 13th, and fellow Spaniard Javier Sanchez, seeded 14th, were knocked out by unseeded players.

The day was not a total success for Burillo, who was ousted eight hours later in the third round by Skoff in a match widely halted by rain. Skoff won 7-6 (7-4), 6-3 late Thursday evening.

## Foreman back in Las Vegas after 22 years

**LAS VEGAS** — The year was 1969 and George Foreman was an up-and-coming young heavyweight making his Las Vegas debut with a smashing first-round knockout of journeyman Bob Hazelton.

More than two decades later, Foreman returns to the Las Vegas Hilton for a fight Saturday night against Alex Stewart as his remarkable comeback enters its fifth year.

"It was 22 years ago I fought in this hotel," Foreman said. "That was about the time this kid was getting potty trained."

Though the years have passed and Foreman won and lost one heavyweight title and fought for another, he remembers his 11th pay fight as if it were yesterday.

He also remembers a boxing-lesson he vowed never to forget.

"Topping the fight card in the showroom of the Las Vegas Hilton the afternoon of Dec. 6, 1969, was Foreman's training partner, former heavyweight champion Sonny Liston, who was trying to make a comeback in a nationally televised fight against Lewis Martin.

The aging but still fearsome Liston dominated the bout and appeared on his way to an easy win before suddenly slipping in the eighth round. One round later, Martin knocked the out-of-shape Liston out, effectively putting an end to his boxing career.





# Florida drops charges against 3 Mets accused of raping woman

FORT-MERCE, Fla. (AP) — No charges will be filed against three New York Mets — Dwight Gooden, Vince Coleman and Daryl Boston — accused of raping a woman last year, prosecutors said Thursday.

State Attorney Bruce Colton cited a lack of corroborating evidence and a long delay in the woman's complaint in the decision not to bring charges. A 31-year-old New York City woman accused the three players of attacking her in March 1991 at a home Gooden rented near the Mets' spring training complex in Port St. Lucie, Fla.

"It was an accumulation of problems," Colton said. "We have to make our decision — not based on whether we believe the victim — but whether there was a likelihood of a conviction."

The announcement brought to an end an investigation that began last year when the woman signed a statement accusing the three players of raping her on March 30, 1991.

"I'm very happy it's over. I had confidence all the way," Gooden said.

"It's been a tough six weeks. I'm just glad to get back to playing baseball."

Gooden made his remarks after the Mets' 7-1 victory in St. Louis. He will pitch the Mets' home opener Friday against Montreal.

"My family and I have been through a great ordeal," Coleman said. "I was very confident in the decision. I knew everything would come out OK."

Said commissioner Fay Vincent: "The allegations were carefully and properly reviewed. Now I hope we can all turn our attention back to baseball and focus on the game we enjoy."

Each of the players passed polygraph tests in which they acknowledged various sex acts took place, but they were consensual.

"The case boiled down to the word of three individuals against the word of one," Colton said, not classifying the complaint as the type faced in a date rape. "These are the most difficult kinds of cases to successfully prosecute."

According to the woman's statement, which was included in a 450-page investigative file that was released by Colton, she met the three men at a nightclub and agreed on to give Gooden a ride home. She was surprised to find Coleman and Boston already there and said she was shoved into a bedroom and assaulted by all three.

"I realized I couldn't talk them out of it," she said in her statement. "I just wanted them to do what ... they had to do and get off of me," she said.

In the days that followed, she said she went back to the Mets' complex several times, continued to date pitcher David Cone, and didn't fully realize she was raped until four days later when she discussed the incident with a friend.

"I can't explain that," Colton said. "It just dawned on her slowly."

Although she made several anonymous calls to the Port St. Lucie police, it would be more than 11 months before she filed her formal complaint. "It's always better

if the complaint is filed right away," Colton said, "but we realize that's not always what happens."

The woman did not have a comprehensive physical exam immediately after the alleged attack, leaving investigators without a "rape kit" of physical evidence such as vaginal swabs, saliva swabs or blood samples.

She offered a semen-stained dress that prosecutors acknowledged was linked by DNA testing to blood taken from Gooden. But such evidence does not address the issue of consent.

Colton said another factor in the decision was that the woman waived somewhat in a voice-stress test.

She was informed of the decision not to prosecute earlier this week.

"She — of course — was very disappointed," the prosecutor said. "But she understood the legal problems — she understood the factual problems."

# Rangers' Palmer aims for home run record

SEATTLE (AP) — Dean Palmer, the new sensation of the Texas Rangers, lined up full of hitting stats, has been trying not to think about hitting home runs this season, even though he's connected in all three games this year.

That's because he dwelled on them too much last season.

"Last year I was so uptight because I put so much pressure on myself to do well," he said. "You know you just can't play like that."

Whatever it's working. Now in his first full season in the big leagues, the 23-year-old third baseman has homered in each of the first three games of a season-opening series in Seattle, all Texas victories.

On Wednesday night, Palmer put himself within a Kingdome short of hitting Willie Mays' major league record of hitting a home run in the first four games of a season. Mays

homered in the first four games of the 1971 season with the San Francisco Giants.

"He's an extreme talent," Texas manager Bobby Valentine said. "Dean's got a chance to become a real good baseball player."

Palmer said he didn't feel any pressure on himself to equal Mays' feat.

"It would be great if I hit another one but we've got a lot of games ahead of us," he said. "Hopefully I'll hit a lot more. So I'm not putting any pressure on myself."

Palmer's third home run in as many nights came on a 3-2 count against Seattle starter Russ Swan in the second inning of a 13-1 victory.

"I'm just up there this year trying to get myself in a good situation in the clubhouse and on the field," he said. "I'm not really trying to drive it. But as far as going out and trying to hit a home run, I don't want to get into that routine again."

The Rangers think they have the best offense in the AL. It's a lineup that includes Rafael Palmeiro and Ruben Sierra, who both had 200 hits last season, but is currently without defending AL batting champion Julio Franco, who started the season on the 15-day disabled list with an ailing knee.

Palmer says he learned a lot after joining the Rangers last season. He's trying to live down his reputation of being a dead-pull hitter who can really turn on fastballs.

He hit 15 home runs in 81 games for the Rangers last season after being recalled in June from Triple-A Oklahoma City. But he hit only 187.

"I think I'm solving my own problems," he said. "I'm not really trying to drive it. But as far as going out and trying to hit a home run, I don't want to get into that routine again."

I'm sitting on the breaking pitches well."

Palmer ended last season with seven home runs in 18 days for Texas. He reported his spring training in Port Charlotte, Fla., with a relaxed and confident attitude this year.

In 60 games at Oklahoma City last season, he led the American Association with 22 home runs. He also batted .299. He's trying to recapture that feeling.

"I think I'm approaching it the way I approached it in Triple A last year," he said. "I'm going out and having a good time. When I do that, it gives me a chance not to worry about going 0 for 4."

Valentine said he noticed a big difference in Palmer's attitude.

# Mack back after pitch caused concussion

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Shane Mack, like everyone else, wanted to see the horrifying replay. He watched as Mike Fetters' pitch smacked off his helmet, sending the ball all the way to shortstop.

Mack was knocked senseless and went down in a heap.

"I saw that I didn't dive in. I just wanted to check and see that I didn't dive in," Mack said Thursday. "I took a step back and I just couldn't get out of the way at all. When I saw the replay, I knew there was no way I could."

Mack struck near the left temple and briefly knocked unconscious, was back with his Minnesota Twins teammates Thursday but not in the lineup. No headaches, no memory lapses, no medication, just a relief to be back in uniform.

Mack was taken from the field on a stretcher Wednesday night and then to a local hospital where X-rays were negative. He was released before the game was over.

"He's fine. The doctor examined him. He could pinch hit. But 24 hours is usually the time period," Doug Nelson, the Twins' assistant trainer, said before Thursday's series finale against the Milwaukee Brewers. Nelson said Mack had only a mild concussion.

"Mack was hit in the sixth inning after homering in his previous time up."

"I remember getting hit," said Mack, who didn't know how long he was out on the field. "I couldn't open my eyes. I felt like they were sealed shut. ... I (finally) sat up and everything was spinning."

Brewers catcher B.J. Surhoff said he initially was concerned about Mack.

"He was out at first. His eyes were closed and he wasn't responding at all," Surhoff said. "You hate to see that happen to anybody."

Fetters, who said he was not throwing at Mack, called Mack in his hotel room later to check on his condition. "They had played against one another in the minors and college."

"It was an ugly sight. I've hit people in my career, but not in the head. That one just got away," Fetters said. "It was wet out, the ball was a little slick and it got out of my hand. If you look at situation, we're down a run and there are two men on, there is no way I'm trying to hit the guy. I'm not even trying to come in. I'm trying to throw it down the middle of the plate. I know Shane and I wasn't too pleased when I came out. There was nothing I could say, it wasn't like I was trying to hit him."

# Former basketball stars end up dead in shootings

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — Devin "Press" Murphy and Chris Tuck were known as the "Dynamic Duo," leading their high school basketball team to two consecutive state championships and dreaming of making it in college ball.

A decade later, Tuck and Murphy are dead.

Police say a bullet entered Murphy's heart on Wednesday, in a shootout over drugs. Tuck was killed in a drug-related shooting in 1989.

But the Dynamic Duo's dreams died years earlier.

"They were good enough to play Division I basketball, possibly to go on to the NBA," said Bill Franklin, who coached the pair for one season at Charlotte High School.

Murphy "was the best player I

ever coached, one of the best I ever saw in a high school uniform," said Ronnie Jones, who coached the Charlotte team to the first of two state championships in 1983.

"He could run, he could jump, he could shoot, he could dribble. What more could you need?"

With the 6-foot-7 Murphy and 6-5 Tuck leading the way, the Charlotte team chalked up a 30-7 record. As a sophomore, Murphy was named Most Valuable Player of the state tournament after scoring 40 points in the finals.

The two worked hard on the court and in practice, their coaches said.

"I couldn't see either one of those guys heading for trouble," Franklin said.

# Stock market reverses course following big 2-day drop

**NEW YORK** — Stock prices rebounded Thursday after two big declines as the government moved to lower short-term interest rates, but traders remained pessimistic about the market's continuation.

The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial

down 94 points in the two previous sessions, recovered 43.61 points to finish at 3,224.96.

Advancing issues outnumbered declining ones by about 2.5 to 1 on the New York Stock Exchange, trading was heavy with Big Board volume at 231.5 million shares as of 4 p.m., down from 249.22 million Wednesday. The rally spanned big- and small-company stocks.

U.S. market participants fear that Japanese institutional investors will begin selling U.S. stocks to cover losses at home.

The move by the Federal Reserve to lower interest rates was seen as an effort to prevent the troubles in Japan from derailing a recovery in the U.S. economy.

The Fed added reserves to the banking

system, pushing down the rate at which banks lend each other money overnight to 3.75 percent from 4 percent.

Traders said the market remained generally pessimistic. They said the Fed's move could be overtaken by rising interest rates during the Treasury's quarterly refunding auction later this month.

The market was helped by a surge in London stock prices on speculation of a reelection victory by Prime Minister John Major's Conservative Party. The main London index rose 1.8 percent.

On the NYSE, Digital Equipment plunged 5% to 48 1/8, or 9.8 percent, after reporting a \$294 million third-quarter loss.

### Early decision to appoint woman harms court choice

If Gov. Cecil Andrus appoints a woman to the Idaho Supreme Court, she'll be doomed to a perpetual stigma. She and everyone else will know she was appointed because of her gender, not her qualifications.

Andrus made sure of that this week, when he announced that he'll appoint a woman to the Idaho Judicial Council puts one on a panel of nominees.

"There ought to be one on the court," Andrus said. "There are certain things, frankly, that men don't have the genes to judge."

That's a novel view of physiology and jurisprudence. But we'll grant Andrus part of his point: a woman would be a valuable addition to the Supreme Court.

But she should be appointed because she's the best choice, not because of her gender. Andrus shot himself and his potential nominee in both feet by prejudging his choice.

It's the Clarence Thomas syndrome, but worse.

Thomas, you'll recall, suffered from the public perception that President Bush had specifically sought a black replacement for retiring Justice Thurgood Marshall.

That perception plagued Thomas until the Anita Hill scandal overshadowed it. Andrus' female appointee will have the same problem in a bigger way. At least Thomas was said to have advanced that he

folks needn't apply. By saying he wants to name a woman,

Andrus is signaling that qualified male attorneys shouldn't bother thinking about the job. And there are many of them.

In the Magic Valley, one name that comes to mind is Lloyd Webb, a leading Twin Falls attorney and former District Court judge. (We'll admit, the fact that Webb sometimes represents this newspaper may make us biased about him. On the other hand, we wouldn't use him if we didn't think he was good.)

But neither Webb nor any other male lawyer has a chance at the job if Andrus gets what he wants from the Judicial Council.

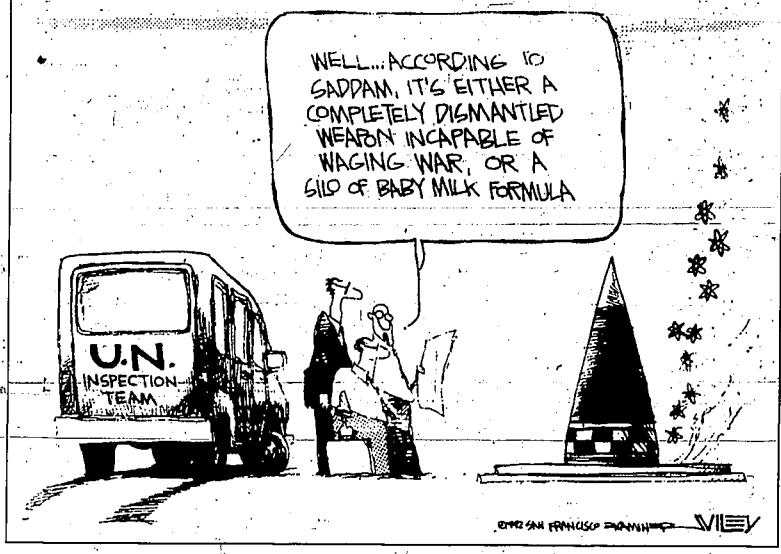
That's wrong. People should get jobs because they have earned them - not because of a quota, which is basically what Andrus announced this week.

That's not to say he shouldn't appoint a woman. He just shouldn't appoint one who is burdened with the stigma of tokenism.

If he appoints a woman, he should make sure he endows her with full public confidence that she was the best candidate available. Unfortunately, he has already deprived her of that by saying she doesn't have to be best - she just has to be good enough.

"Anybody put on the panel is deemed to be qualified, and if there's a woman on that list, she's it," he said.

Yes, that's true. We can assume that anyone on the judicial council meets all the qualifications for the court. Unless he's a man.



### Will the Democratic Party crash again?

For the fourth time in as many election cycles, the Democratic Party is mulling, sinking feeling that they are standing by helplessly, watching as a train gathers speed and heads straight for a wall.

The train is Bill Clinton's march to the nomination. With his victories Tuesday, he now has such a commanding delegate lead that he will almost certainly have the needed majority by the end of the primary season.

The wall is the general election. Although Clinton has been winning impressive primary victories, the sheer number of people voting has been minuscule - down significantly from 1988 in every state except New Hampshire. And Clinton's strength in primaries such as New York's has been among groups - for instance, black and Jewish voters - that are disproportionately important in primaries but less so in the fall. While the political establishment changes its views on Clinton from week to week, praising his victories and dismissing his faults, victory makes not a dent in the relentlessly upward climb of Clinton's unfavorable ratings in the rest of the electorate.

It's very difficult to catch Bill Clinton in a flat lie," writes the Pine Bluff, Ark., newspaper, the Commercial. "His specialty is a lengthy disingenuousness."

With less than half the voters thinking that Clinton has the honesty and integrity to be president and large numbers of Jerry Brown and Paul Tsongas voters saying they'll vote

for Bush in the fall, the Democratic Party appears poised, once again, to give away the presidency.

Why is the Democratic Party chronically unable to put up its strongest nominee? The leaders of the party gave up the right to take part in the process 27 years ago and don't have the guts or the incentive to take it back. When the party reformed itself in the late 1960s, it gave the right to select delegates to small groups of people in primaries and caucuses.

This system may seem normal to those of us who have known nothing else, but it is not used by any other political party in the world. Elected officials, the party chair and other leaders are powerless to reverse the outcomes of the primaries. They have had to sit by passively and watch the nomination of George McGovern, Jimmy Carter, Walter Mondale and Michael Dukakis - each of whom was nominated amid plenty of evidence that he would not be the strongest candidate in the fall.

Once, in 1980, party leaders formed what was known as the Open Convention Committee to deny the nomination to Jimmy Carter and Ted Kennedy. Committee members failed even to sway delegates from their own states.

In 1984, Democrats added the so-called super delegates to their convention: several

hundred party leaders and elected officials who automatically would go to the convention as uncommitted delegates and inject wisdom and judgment into the choice of the nominee.

But the system has never worked and never will. No elected official wants to go against the activists in his or her state. This system would have changed years ago had Democrats in Congress discovered that it was possible to run and win in spite of the performance (or lack thereof) of the presidential candidate at the top of the ticket. And it is this system that has kept the Democratic Party out of the presidency.

The "leaders" of this party will now predictably do the following predictable things: rally around Bill Clinton in public and complain and worry a lot in private. Come fall, they will not expend any of their political capital trying to help the nominee. If Bill Clinton wins in the fall, it will be because he and he alone is able to construct a strategy that causes a majority of the voters who have not yet been heard from to believe they can trust him with the presidency.

If he can't, his nomination will be one more train wreck in the long and inglorious history of the modern Democratic Party.

### INEL underestimates danger of airborne flakes

Unlike Wheaties cereal flakes, the radioactive Cesium-137 flakes that blew out of the Chem Plant are not the breakfast of champions. The public relations people at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory downplayed the April 2 accident

saying, "Chances of public exposure are very remote."

The INEL admitted that each tiny flake of Cesium-137 would emit about 3 mrem every hour but quickly compared it to a 15 mrem chest X-ray.

But the INEL statistic twisters, specialists at the art of the irrelevant, forgot to mention how easily the public could have gotten more than the legal 10 mrem dose that the INEL is allowed to give us.

One flake, at 3 mrem per hour (for 150 years) would equal a chest X-ray in five hours and two X-rays in 10 hours. Ask your family physician how many X-rays he'd recommend for your pregnant wife. Unless we're talking about a life or death emergency, get yourself another doctor if he recommends any.

Natural radiation is always there, but not every state is lucky enough to get extra from the INEL. Wait till we get Dirk Kempthorne's and Matt Schaffer's Complex 21 nuclear super site... oh boy, "Nuclear energy means clean air."

Deep in Department of Energy documents, DOE scientists admit that "the wind controls airborne

dispersion of radioactive materials during an accident." (WIPP-EIS Draft Vol. 2, p. D-72) So if all the Cesium-137 landed within the Chem Plant fence instead of RT20, then we're lucky. But if lighter particles drifted off site, unless they landed right on the detector, then no one would know.

At any rate, it was not a good day for pregnant women and school children to visit the site for a "safe" tour.

We are lucky that a 40 mph Idaho wind didn't blow away the flakes before the emergency crew got out their special vacuum cleaners later the next day.

But the INEL was in no hurry for the same reason they don't want to talk about the lack of wind containment barriers for the Cesium-137 clean up at the warm water pond. Dig it up, rebury it, let it blow in the wind, but don't pay attention to deadly details when we've got money to make.

Like a gang rapist's mentality, "Grease" has been rapid before so one more time won't really matter, will it?

### Sheriff's firing of challenger draws ire

**MAIAD** — Parents and administrators in the Oreida County School District are up in arms over Sheriff Lee Pfeiffer's dismissal of their school resource officer because the officer planned to challenge Pfeiffer in the November election.

But the Democratic sheriff is refusing to reconsider his decision, making no attempt to hide the fact that Kelly Bangert, a Republican, was fired because he was running against Pfeiffer in the fall election.

"His firing puts forth a statement to me that he doesn't like the job I'm doing," Pfeiffer said. "I'm trying to reduce the contention in the department, and this causes a disruption."

### Long-time Lewiston notable dies at 64

**LEWISTON** — Rocky J. Rauch, a popular country musician and the leading morning disc jockey in the Lewiston area, died early Wednesday after collapsing during his Monday show on radio station KRLC. He was 64.

The cause of his death was still pending medical certification.

Besides radio work dating back to the 1950s in Lewiston, St. Maries and elsewhere, Rauch had performed at the Grand Ol' Opry and was a regular at clubs, fairs, benefits and concerts throughout the West for almost 40 years.

Rauch was born Sept. 22, 1927, in Wichita, Kan., and attended schools in Kansas and southern Idaho. He is survived by his wife, Beth, two daughters, a brother, nine grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

### Pocatello considers closing golf course

**POCATELLO** — City officials may close Pocatello's two municipal golf courses to players during the winter because of increasing damage to the fairways.

"We may be opening a can of worms and bringing a lot of hate down on us, but people have to realize there's a lot of damage done and it's costing us money to repair it," Con Gilmore, the city's parks and recreation director, said.

The City Council will be asked in May to draft an ordinance closing both Highland and Riverside golf courses to all but walkers and cross-country skiers during the winter. Proponents of the closure want the ordinance to include stiff fines for violators.

### Scientist seeks to stop lake pollution

**COEUR D'ALENE** — A scientist called for a halt to heavy metal contamination of Lake Coeur d'Alene, pollution he said rivals that of Europe's most industrial rivers.

"The metal levels I've seen in this lake are among the highest I've ever seen in water," U.S. Geological Survey researcher Art Horowitz said.

A century of mining has led extremely high levels of lead, silver, copper, zinc, cadmium, arsenic and mercury in the lake, he told the Coeur d'Alene Basin Interagency Group. A report on the findings of his three-year study calls for action to stop the sources of contamination, carried primarily by the Coeur d'Alene River.

### Andrus urges unity on timber policy

**PORTLAND** — Rather than "volleying charges over the border," U.S. and Canadian officials should unite on a policy to prohibit the export of unprocessed natural resources, Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus says.

Andrus joined Thursday with British Columbia Premier Michael Harcourt in criticizing a U.S. Department of Commerce finding on log exports. It held that British Columbia's ban on the export of logs cut from public lands constitutes a subsidy to the Canadian timber industry.

In a prepared statement released in Boise, Andrus called it "sheer hypocrisy" for the U.S. government to criticize B.C. log export bans when the Forest Service and many states enforce the same restriction.

# Glenn suggests lawyer malpractice fee limits

Republican congressional candidate Gary Glenn on Thursday proposed a 10-point program to change the nation's health care system, including some sort of limit on attorney fees in medical malpractice cases.

Glenn said at a Boise news conference defensive medical practices in response to the threat of malpractice lawsuits adds up to 25 percent to the cost of medical care.

"I support capping what lawyers can earn from medical malpractice suits, which drive up the cost of liability insurance and in turn the cost of health care insurance," he said. "Medical liability reforms should limit the exorbitant attorney fees which cause so much abuse to the

present malpractice system."

Glenn, Ada County commissioner, is running against Senate President Pro Tem Michael Crapo of Idaho Falls for the GOP nomination in the 2nd District. State Auditor J.D. Williams is a Democratic candidate for the job.

Both are lawyers, and Glenn said neither should be sent to Congress because there are too many lawyers in Congress already.

"The people of this state need to ask themselves, as people do across the country, do we need another lawyer for the House of Representatives. Forty-seven percent of all the members of the United States Congress and Senate currently are attorneys, so there's a pretty clear choice," he said.

He said he favors incentives instead

of mandates to solve health care problems.

Williams said he agreed that health care costs must be contained.

"Part of the problem with the cost of health care is malpractice insurance, but we have to remember that before any recovery can be made

in a lawsuit, there has to be fault found with the doctor or hospital involved," he said.

Crapo launched his formal campaign for the nomination with a two-day swing of stops through the 2nd District, starting Thursday morning in eastern Idaho.

## Grass industry, businessmen agree to truce

**COEUR D'ALENE (AP)** — Grass seed growers and a northern Idaho newspaper and resort owner have agreed to end their feud over field burning.

Representatives of the grass seed industry who met with Hagadone Hospitality Co. officials issued a news release Wednesday saying they agreed to stop promoting boycotts, continue searching for field burning alternatives and limit burning to the fewest number of days possible.

Grass growers said they met privately with Duane Hagadone and Jerry Jaeger of Hagadone Hospitality for three hours Monday. "We don't want to jeopardize the relationships that have been formed," Bill Dole, a spokesman for the Rathdrum Prairie Grass Growers, said when asked to comment on the meeting.

Hagadone owns both the Coeur d'Alene Resort and Coeur d'Alene Press newspaper.

Industry giant Jacklin Seed Co. of Post Falls last year asked agricultural groups to boycott the resort, saying Hagadone used his newspapers to unfairly attack field burning.

Farmers annually burn thousands of acres of grass stubble in order to increase seed yields and clear fields for replanting.

## Ethanol boosters fear fuel's future

**BOISE (AP)** — Boosters of ethanol fuel say it soon will be unavailable in Idaho because Gov. Cecil Andrus vetoed legislation extending a 4-cent per gallon tax subsidy.

The governor vetoed legislation extending the subsidy for three years, instead allowing it to run out at the end of this month. The subsidy plans not to cause new ethanol fuel plants to be built in Idaho and cost \$3.2 million per year in highway construction funds, Andrus said.

"As surrounding states create and extend ethanol incentives, Idaho just took a giant step backward," Ethanol Fuel Association Chairman Harry Griffiths said Thursday. "Ethanol fuels will soon become unavailable, despite a large majority of the Idaho Legislature who supported the incentive."

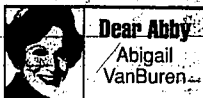
# Rapes on campus need new attention

## Awards showcase red ribbons for AIDS awareness

Whether they wear silk and tails or jeans and flak jackets, many well-dressed celebrities are adding one accessory to their attire these days — a red ribbon.

Hundreds of movie stars donned ribbons on their lapels or shoulder straps at the 64th Annual Academy Awards last week. Symbolizing support for AIDS awareness and research, the ribbons have become a common sight on televised awards shows since the Tony Awards in June 1991.

At least one politician also wears the symbol — Democratic presidential hopeful Jerry Brown's red ribbon has become as conspicuous as his turtleneck sweaters.

That's exactly what the organizers of the ribbon

campaign wanted — to make AIDS a conspicuous national problem.

AIDS activists in Central Florida agree that it helps their cause.

"Maybe if people who don't think twice about AIDS see somebody like Billy Crystal wearing a ribbon, they'll be more sympathetic and more aware of AIDS," said Kathleen Morrow, volunteer coordinator for Central Florida AIDS Unified Resources Inc. (CENTAUR), an AIDS support clearinghouse.

When celebrities wear ribbons on TV, groups say it prompts more interest from the public. The spread of AIDS will be stopped, Morrow and others said, only when the general public recognizes risk factors and abandons risky behavior.

CENTAUR passed out 600 ribbons at the NBA All-Star Game in February at the Orlando Arena, which

featured basketball superstar Magic Johnson, who is HIV-positive. But not everyone would take one.

"I was told by one man that it was totally inappropriate to be doing that at a sporting event," Morrow said. "Another man wouldn't let his two boys take a ribbon."

Such behavior shows "there's still a stigma attached to persons with AIDS," said Allene Baus, chair of Parents & Friends of Lesbians and Gays of Central Florida. "People look up to celebrities, so if celebrities lend their names to AIDS awareness, maybe the stigma will be invalidated."

But others wondered whether ribbons have much effect on AIDS.

"I'm laughing because it's all so Hollywood," said Kate Throop, office manager for Hope and Help Center, an AIDS clearinghouse in Central Florida. "If that (wearing a ribbon) is the only thing that celebrities do, well I would then say, 'So what?'"

# Acclaimed photo exhibit opens Wednesday

KETCHUM - The Montana Historical Society's nationally acclaimed exhibit, "Photographing Montana 1894-1928: The World of Evelyn Cameron," opens Wednesday at the Sun Valley Center Gallery.

The exhibit features 47 striking photographs reproduced from Cameron's glass-plate and nitrate negatives. Her work records the early days on the Western frontier and the growth of the homesteaders which changed the face of the land forever.

In addition to more than 1,400 negatives, Cameron also left behind detailed diaries from her more than 30 years in Montana. Her actual words are used to convey the personal feelings behind the photographs.

"The photographic images are stunning, but Cameron's diary entries bring us an awareness of what life was really like on the plains preceding and during the homestead boom," said Sue Near, service administrator for the Montana Historical Society Museum. "It's history on a personal level."

In a style that approached modern environmental photography more than the formal portrait style of the day, Cameron captured the magnificence of the badlands and prairies as well as the cowboys and sheepherders who were at home there.

Cameron came to Montana from England in 1889 with her husband, Ewen, a naturalist. She took up photography in 1894 to provide illustrations for Ewen's writings on the area's birds and wildlife.

Carving out a ranch near Terry, Montana, the lives of the homesteaders at work and play later

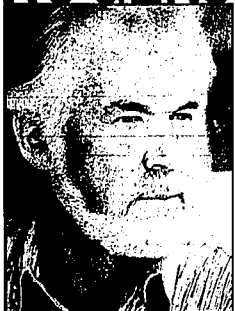

became Cameron's subjects. Her negatives and diaries were only recently brought to the public's attention. # 'Cutting Edge' lives up to its title

**HOLLYWOOD** — Calgary, 1988. A young figure skater, her partner twirling her high above his head, abruptly crashes to the ice, just 45 seconds from winning the Olympic gold. Meanwhile, a star hockey player, moving in for the kill, is blindsided by an opponent, leaving him with a career-destroying 18-degree loss in peripheral vision in his right eye.

This speed-of-lightening prologue launches "The Cutting Edge," a rousing though late-arriving crowd-pleaser of sufficient wit, vitality and intelligence that you don't have to be a teen-ager to be thoroughly entertained by it. Director Paul M. Glaser, writer Tony Gilroy, cinematographer Elliot Davis, choreographer Robin Cousins and the entire cast, and crew deserve full marks for their determination in making something special out of material that so easily could have been bland, predictable or sentimental. The off-the-rink sequences bristle with as much passion and energy as the dazzling skating sequences, featuring some of the world's greatest figure skaters.

Two years have passed, and now Kate (Melina Kelly), the figure skater, is hard at work preparing for Albertville on the huge private

rink of her father's Greenwich, Conn., estate. Alas, the rich, arrogant, sarcastic Kate, quite literally an ice princess, has run through as many partners as Doug (D.B. Sweeney) has applications for hockey teams. A blue-collar Minnesotan, Doug is working in construction when, in desperation, Kate's Russian coach (Roy Dotrice, adopting a thick accent), thinks of him.

Clearly, Glaser and Gilroy real-

ize that the audience assumes from the start that Kate and Doug will end up in a cliché after the obligatory personality clash. Consequently, they strive effectively to keep us guessing about the couple right up to the final frame, and they take the opportunity to make the getting there as substantial, alternately amusing and lacerating, as they know how.

Just because the fireworks subside to allow for a smidgen of inau-

tual respect to develop — sufficient for Doug to give Kate a treasured Bobby Hull sweat-shirt for Christmas and she to give him "Great Expectations" in return — doesn't mean that romance, or even affection, is certain to be in the offing. Besides, Kate is already engaged to a handsome, polished Harvard MBA (Dwier Brown), who runs the London office of her tycoon father (Terry O'Quinn).

Kelly and Sweeney are evenly matched. Sweeney's Doug is a thoroughly likable, All-American guy — an enemy of pretense and possessed of a sensitivity and perceptiveness that his often cocky demeanor belies. If Sweeney is the film's solid anchor, Kelly in turn has the challenging assignment of gradually suggesting that there may be more to Kate than hauteur and snobbery.

Last seen in "Billy Bathgate," Kelly has a forestal presence heightened by her strong features — by the fact that she is attractive while being far from the conventional screen beauty. As diverting as "The Cutting Edge" (rated PG for some adult situations, language) is, one nagging question persists: Why isn't such an unapologetic egoist as Kate a soloist in the first place?

## CSI professors display work at BSU exhibit

He didn't mention that the game was cold against any singleton held by West.

South took his club ace and returned a club, intending to ruff his last two clubs with dummy's eight and nine of spades. This was an excellent plan that would concede only two trumps and a club, even if East held the queen and jack of trumps plus two small ones.

Surprisingly it was East who won the second club, and he switched to a low spade, giving South some second thoughts.

Playing West for a singleton because of his known length in the minors, South took a deep finesse and lost to West's jack. West exited with the diamond king to South's ace, and South ruffed a club with dummy's club. East overruffed and returned a trump.

South's second trick with a fourth loser in clubs lay down one since South convinced himself to play West for a singleton spade because of his distributional bid. South should not risk a deep finesse at trick three. He wins a high spade and ruffs a club with dummy's eight. East overruffs and returns a trump, but the defense gets only three tricks. If West holds a singleton spade instead of an honor, South would finesse East's second trump return after East's overruff, losing only two clubs and an overruff.

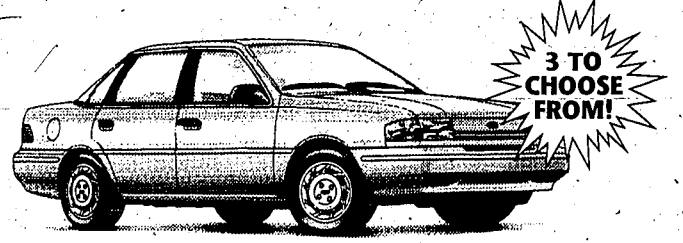

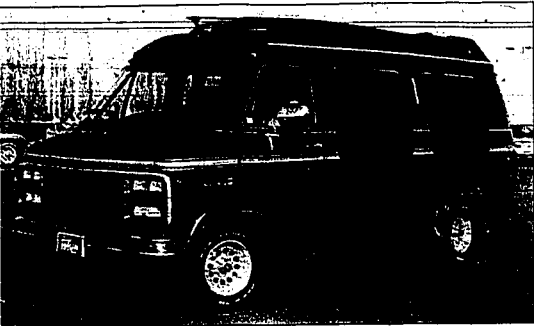

# Baseball coverage gets into full swing

CBS opens its Saturday major-league baseball schedule on April 18. At deadline, the game had not yet been set, but there were three possibilities: Chicago at St. Louis, Detroit at Baltimore, or Oakland at Texas. Two of the games have marquee value, even if we are barely two weeks into the six-month-long regular season.

If CBS goes with the Chicago-St. Louis game, fans who don't receive this game on Chicago Superstation WGN will get a close look at the team's perennial all-star second baseman, Ryne Sandberg. Sandberg, 32, became the major leagues' highest-paid player during spring training, signing a contract that will pay him \$7 million this year. Last season, in 157 games, Sandberg had 170 hits, drove in 100 runs and scored 104 runs.

The Cardinals are a big question mark. Their second-place finish in the NL East surprised most observers last season, and they haven't lost any key players for 1992. Shortstop Ozzie Smith, age 37, is back, and he began the 1992 campaign set to join the 2,000-career-hits club.

We're hoping, however, that CBS opts for the Detroit-Baltimore game. This year, the Orioles open Camden Yards, their beautiful new waterfront stadium, and viewers will want to take a look. According to the network's tentative broadcast lineup, which listed two or three possible games for each of the 16 scheduled telecasts, the Orioles only made the list twice. If they're overlooked this time, that leaves their July 25 appointment with Texas for us all to take a peek at the new, old-style baseball park. The Cubs and Cards will have four more opportunities each to play in a nationally broadcast game.

Five clubs were penciled in five times each: the Cubs, Cardinals, Braves, Red Sox and Dodgers. Six made the list four times: the Athletics, Giants, Mets, Reds, Tigers and Twins. The Rangers and the Royals each turned up three times; the Angels, Astros, Blue Jays, Brewers, Orioles, Padres, Pirates and White Sox twice each; and the Expos, Phillies and Yankees once apiece. For baseball fans in Cleveland and Seattle, neither the Indians nor the Mariners appear anywhere on the CBS schedule.

Among the scheduled performers: Def Leppard, Annie Lennox, David Bowie, Guns N' Roses, Elton John, Metallica, George Michael and Queen members John Deacon, Brian May and Roger Taylor. MTV and Fox will donate their profits to national AIDS groups and local AIDS hospices.

**ELVIS TRIBUTE:** Want more of an Elvis fix than what you can get from voting on a new stamp? "Elvis: The Great Performances," a CBS special featuring rare footage of the King's never-before-telvised early performances and home movies, will air at 8 p.m. on April 21. Priscilla Presley hosts. Marking the 15th anniversary of Elvis Presley's death, the two-hour special includes a fan's home movies of Elvis performing with Buddy Holly, Johnny Cash and Carl Perkins and the emotional rendition of "Unchained Melody," shot six weeks before Elvis' death. Reminiscences will be offered by Elvis' long-time friend and bodyguard, Jerry Schilling; his drummer, D.J. Fontana and his first record producer, Sam Phillips. Executive producer is Andrew Solt, who did the two Ed Sullivan specials for CBS's "Classic Weekends."

**NEW DEAL:** Chevy Chase will star in a late-night talk show for the Fox network next year, the latest sign that some big-money players think Jay Leno won't be able to fill Johnny Carson's shoes. In the deal, announced this week, Chase will host a six-nights-a-week talk show in the fall of 1993. It's the major component of an overall deal the comedian has made to produce, direct and star in films and TV shows for Twentieth Century Fox, the network's parent company. # Springfield springs into ABC sitcom

**Q:** I've heard about a new Rick Springfield series, but have seen nothing in print about it. Will there be one?

**A:** Springfield, pop singer and former cast member of "General Hospital," has filmed six episodes of a new action-adventure series based on DC Comics' "Human Target." The series has not been scheduled, although ABC may air it during May ratings sweeps or sometime this summer. "Human Target" finds Vietnam veteran Christopher Chance (Springfield) fighting crime by disguising himself and taking the place of the individual who calls on him for help. He is aided by a staff of experts and a high-tech airplane called "Blackwing."

**Q:** Did announcer-actor Bill Goodwin make the transition from the radio version of "Burns and Allen" to TV? I haven't seen him in any of the reruns.

**A:** Goodwin did make the transition with George and Gracie to television, but only for one season (1950-51). He quit (replaced by Harry Von Zell) to host his own NBC variety show, "The Bill Goodwin Show." It lasted one season. Later that decade, he narrated the children's cartoon series "Gerald McBoing-Boing," and hosted the game shows "It Pays to Be Different" and "Penny to a Million." Goodwin, who died in 1958 at age 48, also had supporting roles in the films "The Jolson Story," "Jolson Sings Again" and the Alfred Hitchcock classic, "Spellbound." The first two seasons of "Burns and Allen" were originally broadcast live so they are not included in the syndicated package.

**Q:** Isn't Roseanne Arnold using the clout of her hit TV series to push her untalented husband into an acting career? — C.R.

**A:** Let's put it this way. Roseanne and hubby Tom Arnold have their own production company. One of its projects is called "The Jackie Thomas Show." It's described as a half-hour TV sitcom — with Tom as the star. We'll get a chance to see

how good he is as an actor when Dustin Hoffman's new movie, "Hero," is released. Arnold has a small part as a bartender in a Chicago dive.

**Q:** We hear that Raymond Burr is seriously ill, and has stopped making TV shows. Is this true? — M.V.

**A:** Burr, 74, certainly has had his share of health problems: Last year, he underwent surgery for colon cancer, and staged a strong recovery. He then took a spill some months ago, and X-rays

# Guy goes 'Stompin' at the Savoy'

The scary part was being upside down with no one to hold onto.

"Once I got over that," said Jasmine Guy, "was okay. A lot of what I had to get over was fear."

Fear and twirls above the ground were part of the preparation for Guy and her co-stars as they learned a "new" dance style for "Stompin' at the Savoy," a CBS movie airing Sunday night.

The story centers on four women — played by Guy, Vanessa Williams, Lynn Whitfield, and Vanessa Bell

— who come to the city to find an evening haven at Harlem's Savoy Ballroom, circa 1920.

The movie deals with their lives, loves and ambitions, and those of their romantic interests. There's Darnell Williams, opposite Guy; Mario Van Peebles; Whitfield; Maria Warren (Williams); and John D' Aquino in an interracial relationship with Cuba Gooding Jr.

"It's interesting to deal with that in 1939," said Guy. "They were covert, but there was love there. They're treated as people with an obstacle to overcome."

The movie aims to put flesh and blood on characters who, in another treatment, might have been dismissed as background characters or tools of comic relief. "You saw so many movies from the '30s with maids," said Guy, "but you never followed them home."

Or to the Savoy. The ballroom, a center of black social life in New York, was located in the city between 14th and 15th streets, opened in 1926 and closed in 1958.

The ballroom was recreated on a stage in Wilmington, N.C., where the movie was made.

The next job was to teach the players to do the popular dances of the day. That meant swing. That meant the Lindy hop. That meant Norma Miller.

"Debbie Allen found me, came looking for me to do the choreogra-

phy," said Miller, 72, a dancer who makes her home in Las Vegas and makes her living there as a stand-up comic. "She knew of my reputation for being one of the last of the Lindy hoppers still participating in the dance."

"She wanted it authentic. When you call me, you get Frank Manning along with me. It was for the Savoy, so it had to be authentic."

Miller was a vibrant addition to a production staff that came together in an interesting fashion. Richard Maynard, who had caught the net-

work, was looking for a project he could put together for CBS. On a very dusty shelf came a script from Beverly M. Sawyer; it had been around for more than a decade. Maynard enlisted Debbie Allen to direct.

Allen, who produces and directs NBC's "A Different World," brought Guy and another "Different World" star, Dawnn Lewis, to the project. Lewis appears as Ella Fitzgerald.

## Networks' ratings, shares climb in '91

NEW YORK (AP) — Viewership of ABC, CBS and NBC, which rose during the Gulf War, climbed to still higher levels in the first quarter of 1992, the Network Television Association reported Monday.

Viewership of the Big Three networks rose by one rating point, or about 921,000 households, from the first quarter of 1991 to the same period this year, the association said.

The gains in quarterly ratings and audience share were for the networks' regular programming, as well as for "all programming," which includes news and sports specials on such events as the Gulf War and the Olympics.

"Viewership of the three networks has been up or flat at work," said Jeff Bender, an NTA research executive. "We have seen a distinct stemming of the network erosion that everyone has been writing about in recent years."

For the quarter of Dec. 30, 1991, to March 28, ratings for all programming climbed by one rating point, or about 2 percent, to 38.8 rating, up from a 37.8. Shares climbed 2 percent, to 62.8, up from 61.7.

A share is the percentage of television sets tuned in. Ratings for regular programming were up four-tenths of a rating point, to 38.3 (up from 37.9 in 1991); the share increased 1 percent from a 61.6 share to a 62.0 share in 1992, the NTA said. Overall prime time ratings for all programming so far in the 1991-92 season also are up 2 percent over last season, the NTA said.

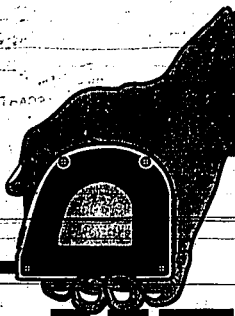
