Fog and freezing weather have sculpted a new look for the Magic Valley the past few mornings.

LOS ANGELES — Scores of building inspectors fanned out over a jittery city Thursday and found huidreds of homes and offices made unsafe by this week's earthquake and powerful aftershocks.

"We're finding the damage is not just concentrated in areas near the epicenter, it's a spread to parts of the central city, said Nick Delli Quadri, senior structural engineer at the Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety.

Delli Quadri said his department is receiving up to 300 calls an hour from homeowners and apartment dwellers worried about returning home. Building in spectors from San Francisco and San Diego were brought in to meet surging requests for home inspections.

"We want to get them in their homes before it rains."

A series of minstorms was predicted to hit this weekend, raising officials' fears about the thousands of residents camping in parks and shopping mall parking losts.

U.S. Housing Secretary Henry Cisneros said damage to residential buildings appeared to hie more severe than first thought.

"think this is a bigger housing problem, then we envisioned," he said in an ABC television interview Thursday. "When you fly over it, you really can't see the problem. But then you get down on the road or in front of the house and you see that it's fallen off its foundation

The safety problem was highlighted

The patients were sent to other hospitals Thursday on orders from state inspectors examining the building for structural
Jawa. Another 150 patients were previously discharged or transferred after
Monday's quake.

"To us it looked pretty bad — cracks
on the wall and broken glass," he said.

Delli Quadri said 4,000 buildings had

been inspected by the end of Wednesday and 250 buildings had failed inspection. He estimated it would take weeks just to check the tens of thousands of structures in the city of Los Angeles alone. First priority goes to public buildings like hospitals and fire stations. Inspectors also must respond quickly to citizen requests for checks of their homes. The demand for safety checks was complicated by waves of aftershocks that often require reinspections of weakened buildings.

"It's a horrendous job, working dawn to dusk," Delli Quadri said.

Beyond safety, the inspections are seen as a key part of returning the city to normal. The green inspection tag, certifying a building as safe, has become a talisman for residents.

Buildings are "red-tagged" if judged unsafe even for entry. A yellow tag permits limited entry but no habitation, until repairs are made.

According to the group, 5,356 children and teen-agers were killed by gunfire in the United States in 1991, the latest year for which statistics were available.

Of the nearly 50,000 children and teen-agers killed by firearms from 1979 through 1991, there were 24,552 homicides, 16,614 suicides with a firearm, and 7,257 gun accidents. The figures come from unpublished data collected by the National Center for Health Statistics.

According to the Children's Defense Fund, homicide is now the third-leading cause of death for elementary and middle school children, ages 5 to 14.

Japanese trading company sells Russian subs to North Korea

TOKYO (AP) — Japanese officials are investigating a trading company that confirmed Thursday it, sold old Russian submarines to North Korea.

It was the second case in a week in which questions have been raised about whether Japanese companies broke the law by selling military equipment or technology to the "isolated, hard-line Communist regime in Propressions"

Tensions on the Korean peninsula already are high because of North Korea's refusal to allow international inspections of its nuclear facilities, a stand that increased suspicions it is trying to develop atomic weapons. North Korea fenies it has a nuclear arms program. Toen Trading Co., a small trading company in Toeyo, acknowledged it sold 40 submarines to North Korea but said the vessels were to be cut up for scrap metal. A company employee, Yutaka Miyauchi, said he could not comment further. Russia's navy insisted Thursday that it sold the submarines to Toen Trading on the condition the hulls be totally dismantled after arrival in North Korea.







1994 should be the year for CSI's new library

When librarian William Beale arrived at the College of Southern Ida-ho in 1977, he found a library already too small for the young but growing

too small for the young but growing college.

The library already had overflowed into an "annex" – an old house half a mile away, where the cataloguing department kept in touch with the home office by telephone.

Beale, the library's director, has struggled to keep pace with students' needs since then. Year by year, the college has added more students and additional fields of study, Meanwhile, the world's researchers have expanded the base of knowledge in each field.

field.

So, each year, Beale "weeds" his stacks. He removes older, less relevant books to make room for new ones that students and faculty members will need. Yet he still hears from students and teachers that they need

"It's no way for a modern college library to operate," Beale says.

Beale is right. He has been right for

years. This year, the Idaho Legislature should heed him.
CSI's plea for a new library is a perennial issue in the Legislature. No one denies the need, but the state's money never stretches quite far

one denies the need, but the state's money never stretches quite far enough.

But this year Idaho has an \$80 million surplus and a rising revenue forecast for the year afiead. The \$5.3 million CSI library project is exactly the kind of one-time expenditure that's tailor-made for a surplus.

Beale notes that CSI's is the only college library between Pocatello and Boise. It serves an expanding student body that includes not only "college kids" but also are residents who are renewing or continuing their educations at all stages of life. The area needs a high-quality college library. We know the Legislature is being bombarded with requests for money. But the CSI library — a need long acknowledged and long delayed — should be near the top of the list.

The hunter must use his skill, marksmanship, knowledge and luck to try to fill his tag. If God or the Idaho Department of Fish and Game cannot put an animal standing broadside at 50 yards when you are not out of breath in broad daylight, then so be it.

If you are truly concerned about the future of hunting and wildlife, then it's time to quit lapping your lips and start to work. If you aren't part of the solution, gentlemen, then you are part of the problem.

If you want more game available, then you need to focus your attention on disease prevention, increased habitat, feeding programs and other positive aspects. You have no control over Mother Nature, predators or automobile fatalities.

You can, however, put a dent in the

automobile fatalities.
You can, however, put a dent in the poaching population through the CAP program. Report poachers. The fact is, for every animal checked legally, a citation is issued for an illegal kill. You can join a beneficial organization such as the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Ducks Unlimited or the Idaho Wildlife Federation and put your money where your mouth is, You can make sure that you are never responsible for losing a wounded animal.

We all have to work together to ensure

We all have to work together to ensure that our children and their children have the privilege of hunting in the future. You have to come up with viable solutions, not blind rage. We need to preserve and increase the game population, not decrease the Fish and Game population, and we all have to do our part. Hunt where and when we're supposed to, shoot only when it's prudent and track any animal that you send a bullet toward.

Want to make your feelings known to your representatives in Congress? Here's how:

On Jan. 10, The Times-News ran a column by John Rosemond on the topic of children with learning disabilities. In the column, he did an excellent job of describing what a learning disability is and addressing some of the issues that surround learning disabilities. Although everything that he said was accurate, I think it was possible to get the wrong impression in two areas that he covered.

he covered.

Mr. Rosemond stated that learning disabilities are not permanent, and that they are correctable. This is true, but what needs to be clarified is that the child's neurological system does not get better. The same "minor neurological malfunctions in the circuity" remain. The learning disability looks like it goes away when the child is taught how to use his strengths to compensate for his weaknesses. However, the academic task is never accomplished with as much ease as it is for a child without a learning disability, because the neurological malfunction remains.

The headline on the column stated,
"Those with learning disabilities may have
to put more effort into learning." Certainly
studies have shown that those persons with
learning disabilities who succeed in life are
those who are the most obsided. learning disabilities who succeed in life are those who are the most persistent. However, I felt like this headline conveyed the message that all a learning disabled child has to do is try harder and he'll get better. This is a commonly held misconception. It must be emphasized that in order for the child's effort to make a difference, the child must be instructed using materials and exercises that match his particular learning style. Then yes, effort will make a difference.

Overall I felt that Mr. Rosemond did an excellent job of covering the topic. Thank you for allowing me the forum to clarify the above points.

German police raid neo-Nazi hangouts

BONN, Germany (AP) — Police seized piles of propaganda and mail Thursday in predawn raids on nco-Nazi langouts across the country.

The raids, intended to gather evidence that can be used to ban the near-Nazi group Direct Action-Central Germany, were ordered by Federal Interior Minister Manfred Kanther. More than 7,000 nco-Nazi pamphlets were confiscated at one location.

Scores of right-wing extremist groups emerged following Germany's reunification in 1990, and authorities say the groups appear to be trying to form a united front. At

ing Germany's reunification in 1990, and authorities say the groups appear to be trying to form a united front. At least 30 people have died in neo-Nazi violence in the past three years, including many immigrants. Hundreds of police officers entered the homes of Direct Action members in Berlin, Brandenburg, Mecklenburg-West Pomerania in eastern Germany and Lower Saxony and North Khine-Westphalia in western Germany, Kanther said.



Deputy State Schools Superintendent Gus Hein told the board last fall that some districts have been "double dipping" by enrolling students in both regular and alternative high school programs and collecting not only basic state aid but the higher aid rate authorized for seltemative programs.

He said 22 of the 113 districts have now established alternative programs, pushing the diversion of eash for them to \$6.7 million a year. Three years ago, the diversion was just \$2.5 million.

He also wanted state reimbursement limited for students enrolled in both daytime and nightime alternative school programs. But administrators of some alternative schools contended those changes would discourage motivated students.

Alternative school advocates said the programs save money by helping struggling students learn new skills they can use to get tobs. The Community School in Ketchum was one of two private schools that lost accreditation.

But Department of Education officials told Board of Education members on Wednesday that no Idaho public schools lost accreditation this year. In fact, 76 of the state's 594 elementary schools and 13 of the 208 middle and high schools improved their rankings from last year, while 47 elementary schools and 20 middle and high schools got lower ratings. Boils Valley Seventh-day Adventist School also lost its Idaho private-school accreditation.

Walton lashes out at EchoHawk, says initiative will last past court

POCATELLO (AP) – Deriding Attorney General Larry EchoHawk by calling him "Harry EchoSquawk," the author of an antigay initiative drew boos from the crowd at Idaho State University on Wednesday night. Kelly Walton, founder of the Idaho Citizens Alliance, mocked EchoHawk for saying the initiative is unconstitutional, and he predicted that the Idaho Supreme Court will wold his proposal.

But Walton also predicted that the U.S. Supreme Court will overrule the state courts and uphold the restrictive legislation if it is endorsed by voters in November.

At a sometimes stormy 90-minute cheate on the initiative at ISU, Walton and Jack Van Valkenburgh, head of the Idaho chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union, clashed over the initiative that prohibits passage of any law or ordinance protecting homosexuals from discrimination.

Experts: Murders are a sign of changing Idaho

BOISE (AP) - Five boys and a girl, all 15 and younger, have been implicated in two southern Idaho murders in less than a week. Experts call it another sign that Idaho may no longer be what America was.

call it another sign that Idaho may no longer be what America was.

"Idaho is no longer part of some isolated island," Boise psychologist Martin Scidenfeld said Thursday, a few hours after at 14-year-old boy was charged with murdering a New Plymouth policeman.

"When I moved to Idaho, 21 years ago now, it was like stepping back in time. It still is in terms of someone living in New York or Los Angeles or Chicago," Seidenfeld said.
"I see in many people a kind of smugness about the big cities. But now they're us."

Family waits, watches as body is recovered from rubble

LOS ANGELES (AP) — On his third day of waiting, Mike Miking with the day of waiting, Mike Miking watched as rescuers peeled back the layers of his collapsed house, the layers of his fell appeal house, the layers of his fell appeal house, the layers of his fell appeal house, the layers of his memories. Just before the world shook apart in those dark hours, she was sleeping, with the family's spaniel, Thumper, cutled on the foot of her bed. Minkow was asleep two floors above when the shaking started. In a drill well-known to Californian, he jumped out of bed and stood in a doorway for protection.

The house pitched and bucked. The ceiling disappeared, replaced by a star-filled sky. The rocking stopped. "Thought, OK, we lost the roof but we're all t'ight," Minkow recalled. "Then I heard neighbors

Guitarist Duane Eddy joins rock hall inductees NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Duane Eddy, crafter of a twangy guitar sound that helped sell over 100 million records worldwide, was among those inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame on Wednesday.

But when he received his honor, he said hismind will be on all those musicians who in the early days of rock 'n' roll took the music to the people on grueling tours.

"Brenda Lee, The Shirelles, Chubby Checker, Fabian, Lloyd Price, Sam Cook — yeah, we'd all be in the same show together," Eddy said.

Eddy, 55, boosted by a personal recommendation from John Fogerty of Creedence Clearwater Revival, got the nod at ceremonies in New York City. The other inductees were John Lennon, El-

ton John, Rod Stewart, The Animals and The Band.

But Eddy wishes more of his friends from the field bus-tour days would be acknowledged, too. Bygone heroes such as Checker and Frankie Avalondescret their due as well as more contemporary artists, he says.

"They were a big part of rock 'n' roll. They were the fun part, the tecny-bopper bit and the pin-up guys. That was what rock 'n' roll was about in those days," he said.

"Brenda Lee — it was only a few years ago that Madonna broke her record of being the biggest-selling female recording artist of all time."

Eddy helped define what a rock 'n' roll recording should sound like with his booming, authorita-

Rebel Rouser," "Forty Miles of Bad Road" and "Peter Gunn." The sound was based on a simple premise: that a guitar 's bas strings sounded better on tape than the high strings.

It was pure logic. But Eddy was the first to put it to practice. He also used a primitive reverb chamber (a water tank with a speaker on one end and a microphone at the other).

And his melodies were so simple that many aspiring rockers learned to play copying Eddy's records (not to mention his James Dean-influenced moody image). Among them was a Liverpool teen-ager named George Harrison, who led a band called The Rebel Rousers before joining The Beatles.



Nonetheless, Sundance, with Redford's prestige and the expertise of festival director Geoffrey Gilmore behind it, has become known for attracting the cream of the crop of independent cinema.

In 1989, the festival presented a first film by an unknown director named Steven Soderbergh; "sex, lies and videotape" won the festival's dramatic feature competition, and the standard of the standard of the plane of 'Or at the standard of the standard o

the Cannes Film Festival and even-tually became the highest-grossing independent film of all time. Other Sundance discoveries have includ-

WASHINGTON — Builders broke ground in 1993 on the largest number of homes in four years, and analysts see continued improvement this year. "Low mortgage sates, better employment gains and improved consumer confidence have served to boost single-family bousing starts in the second half of 1993," said economist John E. Silvi of Kemper Financial Services in Chicago. "These same factors should austain housing starts in the first half of 1994."
Housing, starts immed 7.1 person hand

Housing starts jumped 7.1 percent last year to 1.29 million, up from 1.20 million in 1992, the Commerce Department said Thursday. It was the second straight advance and lifted construction to the highest level since 1.38 million now single-family homes and apartments were built in 1989. Activity improved in every region but the Northeast, where it slipped slightly. In other economic reports Thursday.

• The Labor Department said first-time

claims for unemployment insurance jumped Deby 23,000 last week to a seasonally adjusted 380,000. This was the highest level since since and initial applications.

Some analysis said the unexpected increase could be a sign of sluggishness refurning to the labor market. But economists at Merrill Lynch and Co. said the increase may have been weather-related, noting that other economic indicators have been showing strength.

The Commerce Department said personal income grew 0.7 percent nationally in the third quarter, advancing in all but 11

Ten of the 11 states where income declined were located in the nation's interior, where flooding destroyed crops last year and government cuts in farm subsidies further crimped income. The 11th, Vermont, was burt by declining payrolls in big-ticket durable manufacturing and in construction. Home building activity ended the year on a strong note, shooting up 6.2 percent in

December to a seasonally adjusted 1: 54-million annual rate. This was the highest since a 1.55 million rate in January 1990, and the fifth straight increase.

But the Merrill Lynch economists suggested severe winter weather in much of the Midwest and East this month and the Los Angeles carthquake probably would curb construction early in the year.

Once rebuilding begins in Los Angeles and the frigid winter weather lifts, housing starts should pick up again, they said. They noted that mortgage applications for home purchases jumped to the highest level in three months for the week ended Jan. 15.

Applications for building permits also appeared to confirm the optember, to a 1.48 million annual rate. It was the sixth advance in a row.

In 1993, homebuilding was led by single-family construction, which surged 9.1 percent to 1.12 million. This was the highest since 1.15 million homes were built in 1987.

Apartment construction, hampered by high vacancies in much of the nation due to overbuilding in the late 1980s, slipped 4.7 percent to 161,700, the smallest in more than a decade. Many analysts believe this sector has bottomed and that any rebound will be slow.

Desireably the South posted the higgest

Regionally, the South posted the biggest advance, jumping 12.8 percent to 560,500. This was the highest since 706,000 in September 1987. Starts were up 6.2 percent in December, to a 683,000 annual rate.

Construction improved 4.8 percent in the West last year, to 302,100, despite California's lingering recession. Starts shot up 14.7 percent in December, to a 374,000

rate.
In the Midwest, housing activity grew 3.1 percent, to 296,700, including a 2.1 percent gain in December, to 345,000 annually.
But the Northeast, which has been slow to recover economically, saw starts dip 0.7 percent in 1993, to 125,800, including a 3.5 percent loss in December, to a 138,000 rate.

Obviously hoping that two comics are better than one, NBC has called in stand-up performers John Canonera and Drew Carey to help shore up its anemic Tuesday night lineup, only weeks after putting John Mendoza's "The Second Half" on hiatus.

"The Good Life" casts Caponera as John Bowman, a middle-class family man who manages the Hollest Abe Security Products warehouse in Chicago. Carey plays his unmarried partner, Drew Clark, Together the duo offers lots of locks and different ... perspectives on being a man in the 90s (think "The Mommies" with

testosterone instead of estrogen). schoolteacher and drama director. Their kids are 15-year-old Paul (Jake Patellis. "One Life to Live"), adolescent Melissa (Shay Astar, "China Beach") and little Bob (Justin Berfield, "Hocus Pocus"). Also featured is Monty Hoffman ("Saved by the Bell") as Tommy Bartlett John and Drew's sloppy co-worker.

The scripts, while uneven, contain some sly comments on modern family life and male-female relationships. In one joke, slightly reupholstered from "Sleepless in Seattle." John and Paul share sarcastic memories of Patrick Swayze's performance in "Ghost," only to draw frigid glares from Maureen and Melissa, who sternly warn them, "Don't make fun

of 'Ghost,' Ever." One of the better running gags in-volves Maureen's hopeful but hapless attempts to mount a decent theatrical production using variable local talent. These include a "Camelot" where half the audience left at intermission "Mom, they had to. The kids, while still a little wan at this point, may hold a key to the show's future, since "Good Life" follows "Saved By the Bell: The College Years," a teen hit most adults view as the video equivalent of fun-
