Air strikes can hit wide range of targets

WASHINGTON -planes will strike at a range of targets — not just those inside a designated security zone around Sarajevo — should shelling resume, Pentagon officials warned Thursday.

"If there is shelling from outside (the

"It there is shelling from outside (the 13-mile zone), there are provisions for responses to that," Walter Slocombe, the deputy undersecretary of defense for policy said at a Pentagon briefing. Nor will NATO jets confine retaliatory strikes to a specific battery or mortar,

ry strikes to a specific battery or mortar, he said.

"If there is an attack, we will not put ourselves in the position of having to find the particular gau that fired the particular shell," Slocombe said.

NATO aircraft have been authorized

to destroy-both heavy weapons and 'military-related' targets, he said. Those categories presumably could include such items as ammunition dumps or supply depots, but Slocombe declined to be specific, saying such information could be of use to an opponent.

"If they fire, they not only put themselves, but a whole class of weapons at risk," Slocombe said.

But when asked whether a retaliatory strike could include an attack on Belgrade, Slocombe said targets would be limited to Bosnia-Herzegovina.

More than 100 fighter-bombers from the United States and NATO nations such as France and Britain could take part in the strike force.

The aircraft have been taking part in Operation Deny Flight, patrolling Bosnian air space since April from air bases in Italy and Navy warships in the Adriatic.

Shells rock Sarajevo agam

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina— After 22 months of death and shelling, Sarajevans watched a new cease-fire take hold Thursday. But as midnight approached, the fa-miliar sounds of mortars and gunfire

miliar sounds of mortars and gunfire rang out.
Several mortars landed around the Jewish cemetry, a frontline position in central Sarajevo, followed by bursts of heavy machine gun fire and anti-aireral guns that lasted four of five minutes.
There were unconfirmed reports of fattalities, but no further details on what appeared to be the most serious violation

of the latest truce in the 22-month siege. Earlier in the day, one government soldier was wounded by machine gun fire in another apparent violation of the cease-fire.

It was not immediately clear whether the violations would prompt NATO to begin air strikes, as threatened Wednesday in an ultimatum by the alliance.

NATO gave Bosnian Serbs 10 days to withdraw their guns and lift the siege of Sarajevo or face air strikes. The declaration also gives U.N. thief Boutros Boutros-Ghali authority to order immediate bombing runs against any artillery or mortar positions that continued to attack civilians in the capital.

BOISE – County taxpayers face the possibility of paying millions extra in property taxes, after the Idaho Senate upheld Gov. Cecil Andrus' veto of \$4.5 million in state payments for catastrophic medical bills.

Andrus has insisted that the two programs are linked as part of a 1991 deal he made with the Legislature's GOP leaders. Republicans, though, say that deal is no longer valid.

The outcome of Thursday's vote was not in doubt, as Senate Democrats had indicated for the past week that their ranks were solid. But that didn't stop 16 senators from spending an hour debating the measure.

Anti-gay rights initiative has some voters confused

BOISE - About half the registered voters in Twin Falls, Cassia and Minidoka coun-ties support the Idaho Citizens Alliance's anti-gay rights initiative, according to a Times News poll.

anti-gay rights initiative, according to a *Imess-News poll.* The survey, conducted last week, found 50 percent of respondents saying they would vote for the ICA initiative and 40.5 percent saying they would vote against it. But there also was substantial confusion among those polled over just what a "yes" or "no" vote on the controversial initiative would 'mean, Eagle pollster Greg Smith said Thursday.

That means not only will supporters as well as opponents of the measure have to try to win voters over to their side, but they will also have to make sure people vote the "right" way.

The survey polled 412 people in the Magic Valley's three largest counties on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2. All the respondents said they were registered to vote in the Novem-ber election and "usually" voted on impor-tant issues.

They were asked: "If the election were held today, would you vote for or against the Idaho Citizens Alliance initiative seek-ing to prohibit 'special rights' for homo-sexuals?"

ing to prohibit 'special rights' for homosexuals?"

Support for the initiative was strongest in Twin Falls County, where 51.1 percent of respondents said they would vote for it and 38.4 percent said they would vote against. In The rest weren't sure, didn't know or refused to answer the question.

In Mini-Cassia, however, opinion was much more split 45 percent against the initiative and 42 percent for it, with the rest undecided. The ICA is headed by Heyburn contractor Kelly Walton and is based in that Minidoka County town.

Overall, men favored the initiative 51.3 percent to 36.3 percent, while women favored it 43.8 percent to 40.2 percent.

The sample reflected population differences in the three counties, although Twin Falls County was somewhat underrepresented. The poll's margin of error was 5 percentage points.



The term "whooping" has been applied to the disease from the sound a person makes who has been coughing for so long that he can't breathe. When the coughing fit stops for a moment the person gasps or "whoops" in air to breathe, Becker said.

said. People with whooping cough must take medication and can still be contagious for five to 10 days. Even after the medication, coughing can last for months, Becker said. Most infants are immunized from whooping cough when they get their

Independent counsels get House nod

WASHINGTON — The House voted Thursday to revive independent counsel investigations after rejecting a GOP plan to have the neutral prosecutors conduct all criminal probes of lawmakers. The House bill, similar to a Senate-passed version, would last for five years — and once again allow court-appointed counsels to investigate high government officials. The vote was 336-56. The old law expired in December 1992 after Senate Republicans, angry over the nearly \$40 million Iran-Contra investigation by Lawrence Walsh, killed it with a fillibuster. The two-day debate turned partisan when Republicans proposed that all criminal investigations of House and Senate members be handled only by independent counsels.

U.S. takes hard line on Japan trade

WASHINGTON — On the eve of a summit meeting with Japan's new leader, President Clinton's administration took a hard line Thursday on a bitter trade dispute between the two nations.

Officials insisted the United States would not accept a bad deal just to

Officials insisted the United States would not accept a ban deal just to get a face-asving agreement.

As negotiators worked behind the scenes to try to bridge the differences various administration officials said the United States could no longer tolerate a trade deflicit with Japan that has soared by 20 percent in just one year and is nearing \$60 billion. Prime Minister Morihiro Hosokawa was scheduled to arrive in Washington later Thursday and to meet with Clinton at the White House today for talks centering on trade.

Fired EPA scientist wins job back

WASHINGTON — A scientist fired from the Environmental Protection Agency after raising health concerns about fluoride has won a two-year battle to get his job back.

"I have finally been vindicated," said William L. Marcus. "Fighting the federal government is by no means an easy task."

Labor Secretary Robert B. Reich ordered that Marcus be returned to his \$87,000 a-year job at the EPA and be paid back wages, legal costs and a \$50,000 penalty.

"It was a fluke," Goetting said. "It's something no one could have predicted."

WASHINGTON — Prisons shouldn't become geriatric wards for inmates sentenced under a proposed "three strikes and you're out" law. Attorney General Janet Reno said Thursday. The Clinton administration is considering what to do about aging federal inmates sentenced to life in prison 'under the proposed law, Reno told reporters at her weekly news onference. "You don't want to be running a geriatric ward at age 75 or 80 for people who are no longer dangerous," Reno said. President Clinton supports the idea of putting three-time violent öffenders in prison for life. Legislation passed by the Senate would impose a mandatory life term without parole for people convicted of three violent or drug-related crimes, when the third conviction was in federal court.

She said administration analyses show that if the budget were to be banced by 1999, by the next year the economy would be \$85 billion smalner, there would be 2.5 million fewer jobs and the unemployment rate
would be more than 2 points higher.

Jet program standards continue to slip

WASHINGTON — The Clinton administration wants to further relax-performance standards on the Air Force C-17 transport plane and pay \$348 million to revive the troubled program it may cancel next year. Although costs are rising steadily and performance declining, the Pentagon's top acquisition official, John Deutch, said Thursday that the C-17 nevertheless delivers "absolutely critical" airlift capability to ground forces.

After Deutch's testimony before the House Armed Services Committee, a congressional investigator questioned the usefulness of the program and said there are cheaper alternatives. Deutch, before leaving the hearing, conceded that the cost increase in the C-17 program "is awful."

Both Deutch and Frank Conahan, who led an investigation of the C-17 for the General Accounting Office, the investigatory arm of Congress, presented a grim picture of the C-17, a plane conceived during the Reagan administration.

inmates told lawmakers Thursday that computerized returns and other innovations aimed at easing taxpayers' and employers' paperwork have made the IRS a temping target for fraud.

"I think the IRS is detecting maybe 25 percent of the fraud taking place with electronic filling. ... They're only getting a small portion, 'said Frazier B. Todd Jr., who is serving a 2½-year sentence at the Seymour Johnson federal prison camp in Goldsboro, N.C.

Under electronic filling, available nationally since 1990, authorized preparers and commercial companies can file returns for taxpayers wit computer, cutting the refund time to two weeks. One-fourth of the frequencies will be turned over to the Federal Communications Commission immediately, and Parlow said auction to the public could come as soon as August.







Parents remember nightmare of tortured, beaten British boy

LIVERPOOL, England (AP)—When Jim Ninnim pushed his baby granddaughter's carriage into the shopping mall this week, his daughter warned him: "You won't leave her, you won't take your eyes off her."

A year ago, in the same shopping center, two 10-year-old boys lured little James Bulger from his mother, took him to an empty railway yard and beat him to death.

Now Ninnim sat in a cafe at the mall, dividing his attention between sleepy Samantha Rose and a cup of hot chocolate, explaining his daughter's fears.

Brazil Senate OKs nuclear safeguard pact

BRASILIA, Brazil (AP) — The Brazilian Senate ratified a nuclear safeguard treaty signed more than two, years ago with Argentina and the International Atomic Energy

the International Atomic Energy Agency.
The treaty, signed in December 1991 and approved Wednesday, per-mits regular inspection of the nuclear facilities in Brazil and Argentina, the only two Latin American countries with nuclear fuel cycle technology. The inspections will be made by a joint Brazilian-Argentine commis-erion.

sion. The Argentine congress ratified the treaty in August 1992. Brazil's approval was delayed because of opposition by some politicians. Neither country has signed the 1968 Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.

The treaty approved by the Senate includes an amendment that bans inspections of technological developments that Brazil wants to keep secret.

secret.

The Brazilian navy's nuclear submarine project, for example, will not
be subject to inspections.

The amendment was approved by
the International Atomic Energy
Agency.

U.N. flays **Sudan for** massacres

GENEVA (AP) — Government and rebel forces in Sudan have massacred thousands of evilians in indiscriminate killings and kildnapped children on a massive scale for use as slaves or soldiers, according to a new U.N. report.

The report released to the U.N. Human Rights Commission on Thursday cited grim details of executions and torture in "ghost houses" in northern Sudan and deliberate bombing of civilian targets in warshattered southern parts.

The report by Hungarian expert Gaspar Biro is due to be discussed this month during the commission annual six-week session. It is the first time Sudan's record has been subject to public serutiny by the United Nation's top human rights watchdog and follows years of pressure by Western governments and private or ganizations on the Sudaness government.

In its yearly human rights report, the U.S. State Department-last week described the situation in the visit of the U.S. State Department-last week thron of African nation as "dismal."

Aid workers have caused many casualties and forced tens of thousands of refugees to feec.

Biro criticized Sudan's military fundamentalist government for its application of Islamic law, He said key parts of Sudan's legal code — which provide for execution, amputation or flogging depending on the crime — and the treatment of women violated international conventions.

He said the use of the death penalty for apostasy — or rejection of Islam — was in "flagrant contradiction" with international law.

The charges prompted a furious
response from the Sudanese military
government; which accused Biro ofblaspheming Islam.

"This is an insult to Islam and demands denunciation by all Muslims," Justice Minister Abdul-Aziz
Shiddu said Wednesday night when
details of the charges first emerged.

Biro painted a desperate picture
about the plight of "hundreds of
thousands" of children, especially in
the Christian and animist south.

MOGADISHU, Somalia (AP) — Somali gunmen freed two British lawmakers and a charity worker Fri-day, about 24 hours after they and three other people were abducted in northern Somalia, officials said.

"We can confirm that they are at the ActionAid office in Ergavo and we understand that they will fly out." Friday, the British Foreign. Office said in Lundon.

The captives were identified as Mark Robinson and Tony Worthington, members of British's Parlier, and the Grand of the Glasgow (Scotland) Herald; and Robert LeMare, Jeff Chinnock and Haroun Yusuf, all of the charity group ActionAid.

George Bennett, a U.N. spokesman in Mogadishu, said the six were seized Wednesday evening somewhere between the village of Hared and the coastal town of Mait, about 150 miles east of the northern port of Berbera. He said they were held overnight at Hared.

As his retirement nears, Andrus moves into eclipse

These have to be uncomfortable times for Cecil Andrus. Idaho's most powerful politician seems to have graduated to emeritus status against his retirement next January, fated to watch while the next generation field its own way.

have graduated to emeritus status against his retirement next January, fated to watch while the next generation finds its own way.

Politicians of both parties used to be respectful, even deferential to Andrus. Not to do so was to risk being outmaneuvered and outgunned by a governor who knows how to play constituencies against each other as well as any elected official in the state's history.

But recently, the governor seems to get no more than a polite hearing before politicians, who go ahead and do what they were going to do in the first place.

Four recent cases in point:

Five of the six members of the Idaho Fish and Game Commission, all either appointed or reappointed by Andrus, told the governor to take a hike on the proposal to create a split bombing range for the Air Force in Owyhee County. So did Rep. Larry LaRocco, the only Idaho Democrati in Congress.

The governor is holding the bailout of the Catastrophic Health Care Fund hostage with his veto stamp, effectively raised property taxes by as much as \$11 million next year — a tax increase that local Democratic office-holders are going to have to defend next fall. In the next legislative session, the issue will be resolved, if not before.

Andrus cast the lone dissenting yote last week when the State Land Board turned down Hailey architect John Marvel's grandstanding attempt to lease state land in order to keep it away from a Custer County cattlemen. The other four members, all up for election, voted with Idaho's powerful agricultural



state state spends next year and how it spends it will be decided

will be decided by the Republican majority in the Legislature, closely following the blueprint drawn up by the GOP-controlled Joint-Finance Appropriations Committee. The governor's proposed budget was a starting point, but little more. All of the little indignities could be written off as affronts to the inbe written off as affronts to the in-dependence of a proud politician, but as his retirement nears, Andrus is indeed likely to be less and less of a power in Idaho's political dis-

is indeed likely to be less and less of a power in Idaho's political discourse.

Within Andrus' own party, the most influential emerging voice belongs to Attorney General Larry EchoHawk, an announced candidate for governor. EchoHawk is a moderate whose style is very different from Andrus'.

Andrus may well hope Idahoans will remember him as the savior of the White Clouds and the engineer of prosperity, a governor esteemed enough to have a continuing voice long after he leaves politics. He has, after all, shaped Idaho government more than any other individual for more than two decades.


Nor did he get from the lumber camps of northern Idaho to the Statehouse without considerable ability to know when it was time to hold 'em or time to fold 'em.

Congress can clear air with bill

CHICAGO — If it were any other deadly in-oor pollution that is costing us thousands of wes and billions of dollars in medical care and st wages every year, Congress wouldn't hesitte to ban it.

Why should eigarette smoking be any differ-

ent? Such legislation could do more to save lives and improve health at less cost to taxpayers and employers than anything else the Clinton administration has been proposed Smoke-Free Environment bill, federal legislation that would prohibit smoking in all buildings used by the public. Technically, the bill covers any building that a minimum of 10 people enter at least one day a week. Essentially, it means almost all non-residences.

tay a wood on mon-residences.

The bill would also ban smoking immediately outside the entrances to public buildings. In buildings that are already supposed to be smoke-free, workers usually light up just outside the doors, where air pollution has become noticeably bad.

billion annually, according to Browner.
The health of non-smokers would improve, The least to it non-smokes would improve, Browner said. Respiratory allments would de-crease. The costs of housekeeping and mainte-nance would decrease by an estimated \$5 bil-lion to \$10 billion. Of course, the Tobacco In-stitute is yelling "Prohibition", and calling the proposal "massive intervention in the private lives and choices" of the one fourth of Ameri-can adults who still smoke.

It's about time. For decades, non-smokers have been forced to live and work and eat and ravel in atmospheres dangerously and unpleas-natty polluted by smokers — a massive interference with their lives and choices.

But public opinion has shifted. The old chic equating cigarettes with sophistication has died, along with millions of smokers and others forced to inhale their secondhand smoke.

Passengers can now board most planes without being hit by the stale stench of eigarettes that could never quite be eleaned away. Most hospitals are now smoke-free, as befitting institutions devoted to improving health. Most restaurants now offer no-smoking sections, more or less free from drifting smoke.

But despite hundreds of local ordinances passed in recent years in every part of the country, only about 30 percent of employees are subject to smoking restrictions at work — only 20 percent of them by a flat-out smoking ban, necording to Browner.

The Smoke-Free Environment bill would solidify the progress that has been made and extend protection from this irritating and instidious danger to all workers and to the general public. It would also climinate concerns business people might have about a competitive disadvantage from banning smoking — although studies—show these wortes are generally unfounded.

The proposed legislation would offer a small concession to smokers. Under its prayision, a building owner could opt to set aside one or more rooms solely for smoking. The space could not be used for any other jurpose and would have to be ventilated diriedly to the outside, so no smoker. Hield air would circulate into the rest of the building. The legislation calls for fines of up to \$5,000 a day for violations. But the penalties would have to be imposed by a federal district court after a complaint is filed by an individual or an agency — a cumbersom and possibly court-clogging mechanism.

Passing the legislation would be a victory for Congress as well as for the public. Congress would demonstrate that its members are able to shake free from the heavy hand of the tobacco interests, their hefty campaign contributions and their political clout.

WASHINGTON — The Senate Judiciary Committee has recommended full Senate approval of former Pocatello Police Chief James Benham as Idaho's next U.S. marshal.
Congressman Larry LaRocco, D-Idaho, recommended President Clinton nominate Benham for the post.
Benham, 49, was in the Pocatello Police Department for 25 years, the last five as chief, before retiring last Sept. 17: He was responsible for a department with 100 employees and an annual budget of \$4.4 million.

LaRocco said a full Senate confirmation vote could come within yo weeks.

3 Idaho Falls teens face charges in death

Wilson remains in the Bonneville County Jali in lieu of \$50,000 bond. Brown is free on \$10,000 bond. Insk was released on home arrest because he had an emergency appendectomy, Johnson said.

Teen faces possible life term for pot sale

COEUR d'ALENE — A Bayview teen-ager faces a possible life prison term for selling a fellow student \$40 worth of marijuana. Kootenal County Magistrate Paul McCabe ruled the 15-year-old boy will be tried as an adult under the state's tough Drug-Free School. Zone law, which carries a minimum five years and maximum fite term for conviction of selling narcotics near a school facility. An arraignment is scheduled March 8 in 1st District Court. No one was injured, but two bullets lodged in a man's mattress, Coeur d'Alene Police Capt. Carl Bergh said. No arrests were made after the Tuesday morning shooting.

Bergh said preliminary interviews indicated two women went by the home Monday night and invited the men there to a party, but were turned down. The first two women and another female returned to the house later and woke up one of the men, who told her to leave.

The women drove away, but the people inside heard men and women outside shouting and banging on the door about 30 minutes later, and shots were fired soon afterward, Bergh said.

Hayden plans run for governor

LOS ANGELES (AP) — rormer anti-war activist Tom Hayden shook up the Democratic gubernatorial primary with a surprise bid for governor with a pledge to steer debate toward earnings reform.

Hayden, 54, a veteran state legislator from the city's heavily Democratic westside, said he decided to run Tuesday right, prompted in part by last month's earthquake. "It was really the psychic impact of the earthquake that made me feel that I ought to be fully earrying out what I believe," Hayden said.—There-is an utgency about the times in which we live."

He will wage a campaign similar

in tone and substance to former Gov. Jerry Brown's 1992 presiden-tial bid. Hayden will focus on cam-paign reform and limit donations to his own campaign to \$94 per person

his own campaign to 394 per person or group.

"I have been disturbed by the silence of all the candidates so far about ... lobbyists, corruption and special interest, and think I can be a magnet to draw more attention to this message," he said.

He faces state Treasurer Kathleen Brown — the former governor's sister — and Insurance Commissioner John Garamendi in the June 7 primary.

Republican Gov. Pete Wilson is unchallenged in the GOP primary. Hayden acknowledges his campaign bid, begun on the last day to file for candidacy, is a long shot. He said he will bow out in a month or so if the political debate focuses more on issues he says are important.



Talking, planning keys to dealing with growth

TWIN FALLS — Cities with growing or shrinking economies must talk to their residents and business people to plan for their futures and make economic decisions that consider long-term effects on people and the environment.

This was what 150 business leaders, environmentalists and government officials from across the state discussed Thursday at a conference on "sustainable growth."

civil from across the state discussed Thursday at a conference on "austainable growth."

The dominant chord sounded was that people need to speak up if they want to preserve Idaho as a nice place to live. And speakers said people should band together and set goals for what they want out of their community's future.

The term "sustainable development" is sometimes regarded by runt residents as an urban ploy to tell them how to live and do business, said Karll Brooks of Boise, a former Democratic state senator who is now an attorney with the Idaho Conservation League. He urged workshop participants not to use the term that way, and added that it shouldn't be used as a hollow corporate slogan, either.

Time to change view of using resources, Andrus tells crowd

TWIN FALLS - Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus let a skeleton out of his closet
Thursday - but it was for a good cause.
Speaking at a conference on "sustainable development," Andrus told the crowd of about 150 of a time when he had to choose between protecting the environment or making a quick buck.

As a logger in his mid-20s, Andrus came upon a road too narrow to haul logs out of the woods. The options were clear. He could either go to town and return with equipment to improve the road, or he could simply fire up his bulldozer and drag the logs down a nearby streambed.

With a young family to feed, Idaho's future governor opted for the easy wout - and he's regretted it ever since.

"I probably destroyed 200 feet of that stream because I was in a hurry." Andrus said. Evidence of his riparian transgression is now hidden beneath the waters of Dworshak Reservoir, he added.

Andrus offered his confession as an example of why the term "sustainable development" is rapidly making its way into everyday speech. It's still a dimly understood concept and it is most casily understood in terms of what is not sustainable over the long run.

Other examples of non-sustainable activity cited by Andrus include:

Stagnation of the Snake River near Buhl, to the point where boats are halted by thick algae blooms.

• Overgrazing by livestock, which results in less rangeland forage.

• Chemical contamination of habitat

Jerome ambulance-service squabble will go to voters in May

JEROME - A controversy over ambu-nce service in the east end of Jerome

lance service in the east end of Jerome County will be settled by the voters.

A lawsuit, filed by the Valley Quick Response unit, was settled through negotiations, said Rob Williams III, adorney representing Jerome County.

Supporters of Valley Quick Response had gathered more than 1,700 signatures on a petition to put an initiative on the May primary ballot proposing the withdrawal of eastern Jerome County from the countywide ambulance district. ambulance district.

Jerome County clerk Cheryl Watts, how-ever, had said last week that the petition

would not be accepted by the county.
Dissatisfied with the way county commissioners have operated the emergetcy medical services since taking control three years go, a group from the Eden and Hazelton area is trying to regain control from the

commissioners.

The group was advised by its attorney, former Attorney General Jim Jones, that an initiative petition is the proper course of ac-

tion.

The issue now will be on the May ballot and voters will make a final decision on whether the eastern section of Jerome County should withdraw from the county ambulance taxing district and operate their own ambulance service.

A public hearing will be held before the

clection, Williams said.

"The county has agreed the péople should' be allowed to speak on the issue. If the majority agree they (the eastern section of the county) should withdraw from the ambulance district, the commissioners have agreed they will take the necessary steps to the withdrawal into effect," he said.

"The commissioners believe it would not be in the best interest of the citizens for the east end to withdraw, but they want to people to speak," Williams said.

Valley Quick Response bought an ambulance with donations from the community and a state grant. One of the stipulations of the settlement was that if the east end withdraws from the taxing district and uses the ambulance without the county overseeing

the service, and the state required a refund of its grant, the quick response unit would have to reimburse the county for the amount. A 1991 agreement between the county and Valley Quick Response to provide ambulance service to the Eden-Hazellon area had been terminated by the county commissioners in August 1993. Emergency medical service was then provided by the county ambulance district.

A county owned ambulance was housed in Eden and the Valley Quick Response ambulance taken out of service at that time. Representatives of the unit said the termination was a breach of contract. That allegation was withdrawn and the contract declared to be null and void, Williams said.

If the voters decide to withdraw the Eden-Hazelton area from the ambulance taxing district, Valley Quick Response would re-ceive no financial support from the county. Costs of operating the emergency medical service would be paid by the citizens in that

area.
"I'm pleased Rob was able to get this set-

"I'm pleased Rob was able to get this set-tled, so we can spend county money on mergency services instead of litigation," Commissioner Veronica Lierman said. The county will continue to operate the county ambulance service until the election, Williams said.
"If the people decide it is better to have the East end under the VOR, the County is willing to help make sure that happens," he said





LILLEHAMMER, Norway — Gordy Sheer is at the top of the mountain, the cold making his pale face feel like the sting after a slap. He has just gone faster than man was meant to, and now he's come back to see if he can go a little faster. His last ride wisn't good enough — flat on his back, six inches off the ground/ice whistling by at 80 miles perhour. He needs more.

"There are times when you get pushed into the comer so hard that you feel like you're a part of the comer," says Sheer, a U.S. luger. "You can feel all the gravity against your neck. It's impossible to hold your head."

Sheer swite out a laugh them — he here.

against your neck. It's impossible to nour your head up. We call it losing your head."

Sheer spits out a laugh then — ha, ha, ha — because that's what you must do if you are going to compete here: You-fust laugh at things like losing your head.

It is what makes the Winter Olympies interesting, the way they take us to the edge. The athletes are extreme, like the weather that surrounds them, and beginning Saurday they'll invite us to a place a million miles from summer.

"There's a big difference between winter and summer athletes," Sheer says. "A lot of people say we have a death wish."

USOC seeks dismissal of Harding suit

OREGON CITY, Ore. — The U.S. Olympic Committee asked a court to dismiss Tonya Harding's \$25 million lawsuit Thursday, claiming Congress gave it sole authority to decide who competes in the Games.

In documents filed in Clackamas County Court, the USOC said the Amateur Sports Act of 1978 granted it "exclusive jurisdiction to resolve disputes covering the eligibility for and participation in the Olympic Games."

The committee further contended that selection to the U.S. team "is an bonor and a privilege" and not a rightenforceable by the courts. Beyond the matters of jurisdiction, the USOC also argued Harding's case is not strong enough to warmant the restraining order or preliminary injunction she is also secking.

Harding filed her lawsuit Wednesday, asking for damages and a court order to block the disciplinary hearing the USOC has scheduled for Tuesday in Oslo, Norway. The hearing could get her thrown off the team for her actions surrounding the attack on Nancy Kerrigan.

'Schindler' tops list as Oscar discovers Spielberg

HOLLYWOOD — In a year that brought Steven Spielberg incredible commercial success with "Jurassic Park," his dramatic and risky Holocaust epic "Schindler's List" swept the 1993 Osear nominations this week in 12 categories, including best picture and best director.

It represents the most nominations since 1990's "Dances With Wolves," which also received 12 and went on to win seven, including best picture. Before that, no film had received as many nods since 1981's "Reds," which amassed 12 nominations but did not win best picture. The highest number of nominations in Oscar history was 1950's "All About Eve," which massed 12 nominations but with the received 14 and won six including best picture.

which received 14 and won six including best picture. The best picture nominees, like Universal Pictures "Schindler's List," are all dramas: Miramax Films, New Zealand perlod picce "The Piano" and Columbia Pictures 1930s melancholy romance "The Remains of the Day," both receiving eight nominations; and Warner Bros. action thriller "The Fugitive" and Universal's political father-son drama "In the Name of the Father," both earning seven nominations.

Among the surprises in the nominations were Laurence Fishburne's mattons were Laurence Fishburne's picking up a best actor nod from What's Love Got To Do With It' and the omission of such prominent directors as Martin Scoresse and Jonathan Demme and also "The Fugitive's" Andrew Davis.

Spielberg, whose three-hours

film was shot in sobering black and
white and takes place in Nazi-occupied Poland, said the main juy of the
nominations was the recognition of
the subject. He told the Los Angeles
Tempes, "For-a-subject-that-has-needed'attention for almost half a century, I
am beyond eratified that so many

attention for almost half a century, I am beyond gratified that is many people are not looking the other way when they hear the word 'Holocaust'.

The filmmaker said the news of 12 nominations was "overwhelming" and represented "a-very special moment for all of us who have dedicated ourselves to this subject."

"Schindler's List," which tells the story of how German businessman and Nazi Party member Oskar Schindler secretly saved the lives of more than 1,100 Jews, is the first black-and-white movie to be nominated for best picture since 1980's "Raging Bull" and "The Elephant Man." If it wins, "Schindler's List" will be the first black-and-white film to receive the best picture honor since 1960's "The Apartment."

The Remains of the Day" producer Ismail Merchant praised the Academy for singling out emotionally involving pictures this year rather than simply going for star vehicles. "The Hollywood community is smart, which is what's important," he said. "It's a reflection that the Academy is in the right place."

which is what's important," he said, "it's a reflection that the Academy is in the right place."

The Academy, however, didn't ignore one of the year's big-star, high-concept and most successful movies, "The Fugitive," although star Harrison Ford didn't receive a nomination. The film's producer, Arnold Kopelson, who won the best picture—Oscar-for-the-1986 hit. "Platon," said the nomination was 'an affirmation that a film can be a box-office success and still receive the attention of the Academy." With \$170 million in U.S. and Canadian grosses, "Fugitive" was the third-biggest ticket seller of 1993.

Wednesday's pre-dawn announcements by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences for the 66th annual awards also made Oscar history. For only the second time, a woman — "The Piano's" Jane Campion of New Zealand — was nominated for best director. Italy's Lina Wertmuller was the first, for her 1976 comedy "Seven Beauties." But Campion is the first nominated female director to have a best-picture ongination.

female director to have a best-picture nomination.

Campion, who was ill and unavailable for comment Wednesday, said in a prepared statement: "I feel privileged to be in the company of such interedible, important filmmakers." "Piano" producer Jan Chapman said in a phone interview from New Zealand at 3:30 a.m. Thursday: "This is very, very exciting news, something I wasn't prepared for." She said

None of the nominees has ever won.

The nomination of Altman, athough not a surprise, was an oddity. It is his fourth nomination in this category, and he clearly is highly regarded by academy members, but short of the surprise of the contrast, "Fugitive" director In contrast, "Fugitive" director.

"Short Cus" received no other nominations.
In contrast, "Fugitive" director Davis, who received a nomination from the Directors Guild, was not nominated for an Oscar, although the lim is a best picture candidate.
Academy voters also gave shortfil to Scoresce and his "The Age of Innocence" from Columbia Pictures and director Demmeriand his "Philadelphia," the first major studio movie about the AIDS epidemic, from TriStar Pictures. Neither film received a best picture nomination, but each was nominated in five categories.

'The Getaway' remake should have stayed unmade

There's not much to recommend about "The Getaway," the remake of Sam Peckinpah's 1972 classic road adventure. Whereas the original was an exciting romp of two people on the lam, this update comes off as a crass, pointless little shoot 'em up.

There was a nice, understated quality in Peckinpah's version, starring Steve McQueen and Ali MacGraw. Maybe it was the stars off-screen romance that lent the film some indescribable extra depth

Kim Basinger and Alec Baldwin star in "The Getaway," a story of a master criminal and his wife who try to pull off one last heist.

McCoy (Baldwin), a supremely gift-ed robber who somehow ends up in

a Mexican jail. His wife, Ca a Mexican Jail.

His wife, Carol (Basinger), enlists the help of Jack Benyon (James Woods), a mob-boss type, to help spring her husband, all the while they are forced to match wits with

paying a stiff price for his freedom.

In return, Doc must pull off one last heist for Benyon — a well-stocked safe at a dog track. Working with two partners, they get a few million dollars from the safe, an easy mark even though they must kill off some bystanders along the way.

It's the beginning of a disturbing amount of blithe bloodletting and gratuitous death and violence. In several scenes, for instance, police cars get smashed to pieces with little regard for the fatalities they must have produced.

have produced.

Carol and Doc, of course, always emerge with little more than a

fellow robber Rudy (Michael Madsen) and his hostage-turned-girl-friend, Fran (Jennifer Tilly). Rudy and Fran are little more than vulgar caricatures — he's mean tough, ugly; she's one part himbo, one part haif.

Even the classic garbage truck scene, in which Doc and Carol hide out in a trash bin only to be tossed in to a garbage truck, has a perfunctory, mechanical feel to it. And the ending, which is almost a word-for-word take from the earlier effort, has a dull, plodding predictability to it.

Produced by Rayud Foster, Lawrence Turman and John Alan Simon, the Universal Pictures release is rated R. (Mall Cinema, Ace Theatre)

chance to do four movies this season, he and Miss Powers accepted, But Wagner, who serves as an executive producer, still admitted to some initial reservations.




