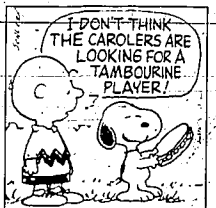

Panel endorses televised trials

TWIN FALLS — A former state Supreme Court chief justice, Robert Bakes, warns that courtroom cameras "could have a substantial impact on the administration of justice" in Idaho.

But Thursday, an advisory committee said Idaho should lift its ban on televised trials—at least temporarily.

The Supreme Court's committee on

cameras in the courtroom, meeting in Boise, recommended that the court allow televised court proceedings for a one-year trial period. It narrowly rejected a motion, by Twin Falls attorney Ken Pedersen, to continue the ban.

The committee, composed of lawyers, judges, and media representatives, met for more than two hours Thursday before

making its final recommendation.

Ultimately, the state's high court will decide the issue. Two of the court's five members, Chief Justice Charles McDevitt and Justice Kathy Slik, serve on the advisory committee, but neither judge revealed where they stand on the issue, Pedersen said.

But Bakes, McDevitt's predecessor, said

criminal trials should not become spectacles.

"I think this O.J. Simpson trial points out the importance of not turning out counts into a media event," Bakes said. "I would think they would be very cautious before they start down that road."

Bakes wasn't the only one to mention the Simpson case—and trial by television. Pedersen said Simpson's case shows that commercial television violates the jury

Green Giant sells Buhl vegetable plant

New York-based new owner may expand facility; no layoffs in works

TWIN FALLS — The Buhl vegetable canning and freezing plant has been "targeted" for expansion by New York-based Seneca Foods Corp.

The company announced Thursday it is buying the packinghouse and five other Green Giant plants from Pillsbury for \$72 million.

The Buhl plant is expected to double the farm acreage under contract for sugar snap pea production and add 100,000 square feet of frozen-vegetable storage, said the plant's distribution manager, Liz Mandelkow.

Buhl got lucky in the deal. Pillsbury announced Thursday that it was closing four Midwest Green Giant plants.

"We are not closing our door, we will have no lay-offs," Mandelkow said. The Buhl packinghouse employs 86 people year-round and 750 people between July and October when freshly harvested vegetables are processed.

Most of the peas and corn packed in Buhl by Seneca will be sold back to Green Giant under a 20-year contract also announced Thursday.

Said Pillsbury public affairs manager Nancy Perron: "We essentially will be out of the primary processing of vegetables in the United States."

Last year, Green Giant turned over some of its vegetable processing to Boise's J.B. Singlet Co., Perron said.

The transaction places the 300,000-square-foot Buhl plant in the hands of a publicly traded U.S. company. Pillsbury-Green Giant is owned by the London-based mega-corporation Grand Metropolitan PLC.

Seneca's over-the-counter stock closed Thursday at a new 1994 high \$34.50

per share — up \$3 from Wednesday's close, said broker Fred Nelson of A.G. Edwards & Sons Inc. in Twin Falls. Meanwhile, Grand Met's stock dropped 25 cents to \$24 per share.

Seneca had sales of \$290 million in the fiscal year that ended in July.

While plant officials in Buhl and at Pillsbury were eager Thursday to talk about Seneca's plans for the plant, a spokeswoman at Seneca's Pittsford, N.Y., headquarters offered cautious statements about the Buhl plant's future.

"We need to get our heads together a little bit better," said Deyra Beyona. She did not rule out expansion for the plant, however.

Pillsbury's Perron said her company will continue to look to the Buhl plant for canned corn for export to Japan.

The transaction depends on the Federal Trade Commission's approval.

"We anticipate that the deal will close sometime in January," Perron said.

Neither company would disclose the sales price of the Buhl factory alone. The other five plants changing hands are in Mayville, Wis.; Dayton, Wash.; Glenview, Minn.; Montgomery, Minn.; and Blue Earth, Minn.

Pillsbury will close plants in Le Sueur, Minn.; Ripon and Beaver Dam, Wis.; and Hoopston, Ill. over the next 18 months.

All the plants are largely used for seasonal production.

The closures will cost Pillsbury about \$65.5 million, which will be reflected in Grand Met's 1994-95 earnings.

Pillsbury expects to save about \$32.8 million a year once the agreement is implemented. It retains brand ownership and marketing and technology rights of Green Giant, including ownership of its proprietary variety seeds.

Forget more waste shipments, Andrus tells Navy

BOISE — Retiring Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus rejected the U.S. Navy's request to send eight additional shipments of high-level radioactive waste to the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory early next year.

In a letter to the Navy's general counsel, Steven Honigman, Andrus said the Navy and its top brass — including Admiral Bruce DeMars, director of the Naval Nuclear Propulsion Program — failed to justify the need for exceeding the 18 waste shipments authorized under a 1993-court order curbing the use of INEL as a nuclear waste dump.

"The state of Idaho has no intention of becoming a permanent repository for high-level nuclear fuel that is shipped into our state simply because the Navy wants to send it to some 'remote place' as stated by Admiral DeMars," Andrus wrote in Wednesday's letter.

"The federal government and the U.S. Navy simply must come to grips with this continuing problem and be a party to the resolution of it," the governor wrote.

But the request to make the additional shipments, initiated Oct. 12 by Defense Secretary William Perry, will become the first major test of whether the new administration of Republican Gov.-elect Phil Batt shares Andrus' resolve to halt use of the INEL for waste storage.

Andrus was expected to discuss the situ-

ation by week's end with Batt, who declared his opposition to the INEL becoming the nation's nuclear waste dump during the campaign.

Clinton signs trade pact

WASHINGTON — Signing a pact to slash tariffs around the globe, President Clinton defended his trade policy Thursday against critics who say it will pit U.S. workers against low-wage employees abroad.

"We must never run away from the world," he declared moments before signing legislation authorizing the United States to join with 123 nations in the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade.

GATT passed Congress by lopsided margins in a rare lame-duck session.

GATT foes said the World Trade Organization established under the accord represents an unprecedented infringement on American sovereignty. Opponents also charged GATT would make American workers more vulnerable to competition from low-wage workers in other countries.

U.S. to cover U.N. Bosnia pullout

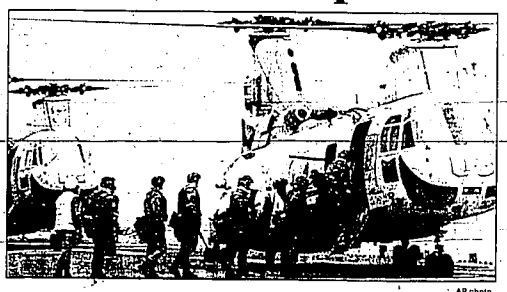
WASHINGTON — The Clinton administration formally notified NATO allies and congressional leaders Thursday that it would provide American ground troops to help evacuate United Nations peacekeeping forces from Bosnia if a withdrawal is requested, U.S. officials said.

The commitment involves providing about half the evacuation protection force, meaning from 5,000 to 25,000 American troops.

A withdrawal would be a massive, highly complex and potentially dangerous operation for allied forces given Bosnia's mountainous terrain, wide dispersal of U.N. forces, and unremitting warfare between separatist Serbs and the Muslim-led government, officials said.

Senior administration officials said President Clinton had decided on the move Tuesday, at the recommendation of his senior advisors. The decision followed several days of discussions about how U.S. policy toward Bosnia would change if U.N. forces were withdrawn.

In such cases, officials said, the administration would return to the policy it pur-

Reviews: Gingrich may split party

WASHINGTON (AP) — Newt Gingrich's early public reviews suggest he is on a path to becoming the most polarizing major figure in American politics, a distinction some Republicans worry could ultimately hurt the party.

In making this point, independent pollsters and some Republicans draw a comparison to President Clinton and data showing that support for policy positions slips when Clinton's name is attached.

But that dynamic is far more likely to affect a president than the speaker of the House, the job Gingrich, R-Ga., will assume Jan. 4. And in any event, the public's questions about Gingrich don't appear to have adversely affected its view of the GOP agenda.

A Times Mirror Center for the People and the Press survey released this week, for example, showed 52 percent supported the Republicans' plans while 28 percent opposed them and 20 percent weren't sure.

But the same survey suggested Gingrich is not sharing in the glow of the Republican election victory: 25 percent said they have a favorable opinion of him, while 28 percent had an unfavorable view. Thirty percent said they had never heard of Gingrich, and 17 percent said they didn't know enough to offer an opinion.

Given Gingrich's prominent media profile since the election, it is somewhat surprising that nearly one-third of the public says it has never heard of him. But just five months ago, 65 percent said that "his name identity is rising rapidly."

In May 1990, by comparison, near-

ly half of Americans had never heard of Rep. Thomas Foley, who by then had been House speaker for nearly a year. But of those who had, Foley was rated favorably by 20 percent and unfavorably by just 9 percent. By March 1991, Foley's name recognition has risen substantially, and 41 percent viewed him favorably while the percentage viewing him unfavorably ticked up to just 10 percent.

In Gingrich's case, the percentage

viewing him unfavorably has gone from 12 percent in July to 28 percent in the survey conducted last weekend. "Gingrich is a lot more partisan than Foley," said GOP pollster Neil Newhouse. But, he said, "How he is viewed this month is irrelevant to how he is viewed after he actually takes power."

Indeed, many Republicans predict Gingrich's ratings will improve dramatically if House Republicans cut

committees, adopt a balanced budget amendment and move quickly on other reforms. "The message and agenda he has is exactly on the mark of what people want," said GOP pollster Ed Goetz.

Democrats are aggressively trying to muddy Gingrich's image, repeatedly attacking his politics as extreme as well as demanding an ethics investigation into the financing of a college course he taught. "He is the most dangerous man in America to the Democratic Party," Goetz said.

While optimistic Gingrich will use his formidable political skills to boost his image, even many of his biggest fans are worried about the early polling trends.

"It concerns me greatly," said Republican pollster Frank Luntz, "I watched how (then-Speaker) Tip O'Neill came to represent all that was wrong with the Democrats in 1980."

Luntz complained that Gingrich is often quoted out of context by the media. But he conceded Gingrich makes his fair share of enemies on his own because "he doesn't mince words."

In the past week alone, for example, Gingrich has accused up to 25 percent of the White House staff of using illegal drugs in recent years and defended a proposal to create orphanages for the children of women who could not afford to support them.

"I think he is going to be more polarizing than Clinton because he says harsher things," said Andy Kohn, the Times Mirror survey director.

Public stations face uncertain financial future

WASHINGTON (AP) — Their coffers have long been shielded by Democrats, but public broadcasters could lose millions of federal dollars a year under the new Republican-controlled Congress.

Incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., says he wants to eliminate federal funding for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, long the target of conservative criticism.

As a key overseer of the CPB, Sen. Larry Pressler, R-S.D., incoming chairman of the Senate Commerce Committee, also is interested in eliminating some funding.

But Pressler said in an interview he'd like to preserve some financial support to sustain existing children's programs and to create new ones. His House counterpart, Rep. Thomas Bliley, R-Va., who will be chairman of the House Commerce Committee, has not disclosed his stand on the issue.

Senate Republican Leader Bob Dole of Kansas isn't taking a stand yet, although he says, "We'll carefully review federal funding of public broadcasting when it comes up for reauthorization next year."

All federal money for public broadcasting goes to CPB, which does it out, using complex formulas, to public stations and groups, including the Public Broadcasting Service and National Public Radio.

Public broadcasters say the federal money helps them attract corporate funding for new programs, and the elimination of CPB would make that more difficult.

The effect on well-known public broadcasting programs would be mixed, however. For example, the "Mastpiece Theater" and "Sesame Street" television programs and "All Things Considered" on NPR were started with CPB funding, but no longer directly receive it. The "MacNeil-Lehrer-NewsHour" on television and "Marketplace" on Public Radio International and "Talk of the Nation" on NPR still get CPB funding.

CPB gets all of its money from Congress. Its budget for fiscal 1995, which began in October, is \$285.6 million, said spokeswoman Jeannie Burton. Congress has already agreed to authorize roughly \$300 million in 1996. After that, CPB's fate could be uncertain.

CPB in 1993 contributed 14.2 percent of the industry's \$1.79 billion total income, but federal money is critical to individual stations. It makes up from 4 percent to 40 percent of a station's budget.

Star Trek, the suit: Dealers accused of illegal enterprise

ATLANTA (AP) — The producer of the hit movie "Star Trek: Generations" has accused two memorabilia dealers of boldly going too far — selling bootleg copies of the film's script.

The enterprise is illegal, says Paramount Pictures Corp., which has asked a U.S. District Court judge in Atlanta to shut it down.

The lawsuit names as defendants Joe Kindle, identified only as being from Connecticut, and The Omega Zone, a movie memorabilia shop in New York. The pair also are accused of selling a bootleg script for "Star Trek: Voyagers," a television series set to debut next year.

Paramount sued last month after an executive of the company's parent, Viacom Inc., said he bought copies of the scripts for \$35 a Star Trek fans' convention in Atlanta before the movie opened.

The movie, which ranks No. 2 in the nation with a \$57.6 million gross after three weeks, went through several changes from its initial script — the one that being sold — to the final version, Paramount said in its lawsuit.

Senators attack orphanage plan

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two Democratic senators — one an orphan — slammed incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich on Thursday for his proposal to send children of some poor, teen-age mothers to orphanages rather than give them welfare.

"Your proposal that poor kids be snatched out of their homes simply because their parent or parents are poor is callous and wrongheaded," North Dakota Sens. Byron Dorgan and Kent Conrad wrote Gingrich.

"It represents a coldhearted, anti-family retreat to the long-failed past."

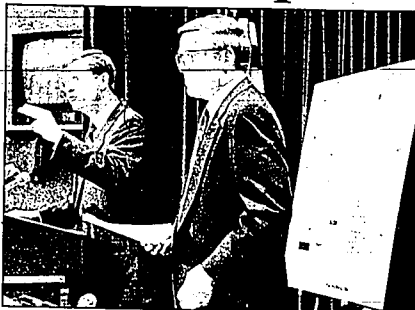
Conrad said at a news conference he was orphaned at age 5, when both his parents were killed by a driver who fell asleep at the wheel. He was in the car at the time.

He said he was very fortunate to have had loving grandparents who could take care of him.

"But if you look at what is happening across the country, there are millions of loving families who are poor and are on assistance."

Conrad said it was wrong to disrupt those family networks unnecessarily.

The welfare reform proposal in

The Republican "Contract With America" would deny welfare and housing payments to unwed teen-age mothers, sending the money saved to the states to set up alternative programs, including orphanages.

Dorgan and Conrad said they

agreed with the Republicans that something had to be done to discourage children from giving birth to children, and to get rid of incentives that encourage unwed motherhood.

Conrad suggested that, instead of looking to orphanages as a model

from the past, Congress instead look at the settlement houses that helped new immigrants learn the tools they needed to survive at the turn of the century. They also said Congress should continue to vigorously pursue programs to track down parents who do not provide child support.

In recent days, Gingrich has spoken of orphanages as an idea of last resort, implying that they would be used only in cases where parents were unfit or children were abused, for example.

"We say to a 13-year-old drug addict who is pregnant, you know, put your baby in a dumpster, that's OK, but we're not going to give you a boarding school," he said Sunday on NBC's "Meet the Press."

But Conrad and Dorgan said the GOP proposal goes much farther.

"Sometimes in public life, the best thing you can do is simply admit that you made a mistake," they wrote Gingrich. "That's what you need to do."

Admit your plan to take children away from their mothers and put them in government orphanages is a bad idea, drop it from your contract and change your legislation."

Whip: Gingrich case needs outside counsel

WASHINGTON (AP) — Turning up the political heat on incoming Speaker Newt Gingrich, Democratic Whip David Bonior called today for an outside counsel to investigate an ethics complaint against the Georgia Republican.

Bonior, D-Mich., said Gingrich "is faced with a conflict of interest" because he has "refused to recuse himself from naming members" of the next Committee on Standards of Official Conduct — the ethics committee.

A Democratic political opponent of Gingrich, former Rep. Ben Jones, filed the complaint. He accused the next speaker of improperly using his staff and abusing federal tax law in preparing and teaching a college course in Georgia.

"In nearly every single high visibility ethics case since 1979, the ethics committee has retained outside counsel to investigate the charges," Bonior told a news conference.

The current ethics committee has postponed action on whether to launch a formal investigation of Gingrich. It is uncertain whether the committee will meet again this year, and, unless it does so and dismisses the case, the matter will be taken up by the next ethics panel.

Gingrich spokesman Tony

Blankley said he expected the current committee to dispose of the matter this year.

"Mr. Bonior's request for an outside counsel is ill-considered. The matter is currently pending before the

ethics committee of the 103rd Congress. I fully expect that committee to favorably complete its deliberations in the time remaining to it," Blankley said.

Jones' complaint, and news stories, have said contributors to the course received tax breaks, because the donations were made to tax-exempt foundations. The complaint said there should have been no tax break, since money funded a course that teaches conservative Republican philosophy and has a goal of recruiting young Republicans to be active in the GOP.

The complaint also said Gingrich's staffers were used in connection with the course, when they should have only been performing official duties.

Post office will drop stamp marking atomic bomb blast

WASHINGTON (AP) — The post office, under heavy White House and diplomatic pressure, is scrapping plans for a stamp recalling the atomic bombing of Japan.

"We are changing the design of the stamp because of the importance of U.S.-Japan relations at this critical time in U.S. foreign policy, and because President Clinton conveyed his views that it was appropriate to do so," Postmaster General Marvin Runyon said Thursday.

The stamp — which was to depict a mushroom cloud following a bomb blast — will be replaced by a design showing President Truman preparing to announce the end of the war.

Controversy swirled around the stamp almost from the moment last month when its design was disclosed,

along with many other stamps planned for 1995. Japanese officials were outraged over the design and filed protests.

The Postal Service initially defended the stamp as commemorating a crucial event in the war that needed to be part of the series of World War II stamps spread over several years.

Runyon said he was particularly mindful of the feelings of veterans — who make up a large part of the postal work force. "Many gave their lives for their country and we will always be grateful for their paying the ultimate price," Runyon said.

The post office's governing board discussed the controversy at a closed meeting recently and directed Runyon not to change the stamp unless Clinton called for the move.

English law overturned

PHOENIX (AP) — States can encourage use of a common language, but not by outlawing other tongues, a federal appeals panel said in ruling Arizona's "official English" law unconstitutional.

"Free speech includes choice of language," the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco said Wednesday.

The amendment ordering governments to conduct all business in English interferes with the ability of non-English-speaking citizens to communicate, the panel said.

Seventeen other states have "official English" laws, but unlike Arizona's they appear mainly symbolic, the court said. California, for example, declares English the state language but does not restrict government use of other languages.

Arizona's law is the most restrictive passed anywhere in the nation since World War I, when several states tried to outlaw German, said Stephen Montoya, lawyer for Arizona's Against Constitutional Tampering, which led the challenge to the law.

"Two years is enough," Rep. Kweisi Mfume, D-Md., said Wednesday after a news conference to decry the GOP plan to cut funding for the caucus and 27 others.

Mfume said he did not have a

favorite among the three candidates hoping to succeed him. Rep. Donald Payne of New Jersey, Rep. Alcee Hastings of Florida and Rep. Harold Ford of Tennessee. All three are Democrats.

Mfume and Rep. Jose Serrano, D-N.Y., chairman of the Hispanic Caucus, said no taxpayer money will be saved because lawmakers support the caucuses out of their own office funds.

Politician
hopes to oust
former party

TOKYO (AP) — Toshiki Kaifu, whose clean image propelled him to Japan's prime ministership five years ago, was elected Thursday to lead a new opposition alliance that hopes to oust the party he once headed.

Kaifu's return to prominence to battle his old party was a reminder of how much — and perhaps how little — Japanese politics has changed since he stepped down as prime minister three years ago.

With voters disgusted by money scandals, the conservative Liberal Democrats to which Kaifu belonged lost power last year for the first time in 38 years. Four men have since rotated through the prime minister's job.

The Liberal Democrats regained power in June in a coalition with Prime Minister Tomichi Murayama's Socialist party. Kaifu quit the LDP in protest.

When nine political groups come together Saturday to launch the New Frontier Party, they will control about two-fifths of the Parliament's more powerful lower house, almost as much as the LDP.

Kaifu warned Thursday that Japan's ailing economy, the world's second largest, was in danger of losing key industries unless the government acts to cut cumbersome regulations.

"We need decisive reforms," he said. "When I look at the LDP and Socialist government, I see support only for the status quo."

But his new party, like the LDP, is made up of conservatives, and has yet to distinguish itself from its opponents.

Even new party legislators acknowledge they lack specifics on how to reform Japan.

Still, Kaifu remains popular among voters and the New Frontier Party could win a general election, expected next year by most analysts.

Kaifu, 63, though a legislator since 1960, was little known to most Japanese until 1989, when his clean past became a plus after a series of financial scandals involving top Liberal Democrats.

But LDP elders forced him to step down as prime minister in October 1991 after he promised to implement anti-corruption reforms.

**Belgian minister
resigns in scandal**

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — For the fourth time this year, a top government official has been forced out of office, but the center-left coalition of Prime Minister Jean-Luc Dehaene is expected to survive.

Defense Minister Leo Delcroix resigned Thursday after he was implicated in a shady real-estate deal.

After earlier denials, Delcroix admitted Wednesday he owned a villa in southern France worth \$450,000 to \$600,000. But he denied allegations that the villa was built with illegal funds and illegal labor.

Delcroix said he stepped down to keep the government from becoming implicated in the scandal.

Dehaene announced a fellow Christian Democrat, Karel Pinxten, would succeed Delcroix.

Pinxten is an expert in economics and foreign trade and has relatively little experience in defense and strategic issues.

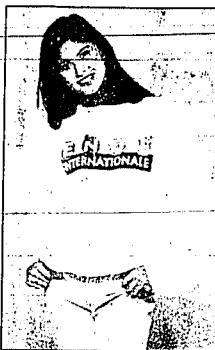

Gun incident may be a shot across our bow

Next week the Twin Falls School Board will talk about expelling kids who bring guns to school. Good. But it also should talk about whether that's enough.

The community was shocked this week by news that a 12-year-old girl had been caught packing a .357 Magnum (Dirty Harry's weapon of choice) at O'Leary Junior High School.

The incident reinforced local fears about a national problem. Americans are horrified by the violence and terror that rule many urban schools. People move to Idaho to escape such surroundings, and this week's news story sounded an alarm. The barbarians, it seemed, had found our doorstep.

Well, maybe. The handgun incident may have been a symptom of a broader social problem, or it may simply have been one child's dangerous stunt.

Either way, it was not the first such incident locally. Last spring, as the school district prepared to adopt its "zero-tolerance" policy for weapons, high school administrators wrote to the board, "We have reason to believe weapons are on our campus — some have been confiscated."

So, regardless of this incident's actual significance, it may turn out to be a needed catalyst for public awareness. It may focus attention on an embryonic problem that grows into a fully developed monster.

In cities whose quality of life is degraded beyond redemption, residents look back and say, "If only we had seen it coming! If only we had started fighting back sooner!"

In Idaho, "sooner" is still here. We have time for defensive measures, to ensure that the next generation of children can learn in an environment free of danger and intimidation.

The Twin Falls School Board — along with boards in some other valley cities — already has made a good start with its zero tolerance policy. The policy lets administrators suspend students immediately if they catch them with guns, knives or other weapons, and expulsion can follow. Under the 1994 Federal Crime Bill, expulsion may soon become mandatory.

Meanwhile, police patrol the campuses. Authorities inspect lockers periodically, and they run down all rumors about weapons. (That's how they found the .357.)

All these are good steps. But are they enough?

In our view, school leaders should think once again about metal detectors at secondary schools. They also should research the experience of more urbanized areas, to learn about programs or approaches that could help.

In Boise this winter, state legislators should vigorously pursue plans to shake up Idaho's juvenile-justice system.

Parents should take on a role too. They should talk with their kids about these issues, monitor the children's behavior, and ask school authorities how they can be involved in keeping schools safe.

One handgun is not necessarily a crisis. But we would be foolish to go on believing ourselves immune. We are not.

The city is deciding whether to develop additional bike routes (Routes B and D) in town. It is up to the City Council to weigh the gains and the losses and make the tough decisions. As part of the process, they will listen to and consider the opinions of the citizens on at 6 p.m. Monday at City Hall. Those who would lose parking will be there to express their views. If you believe we need bike routes, don't assume someone else will be there to express your voice.

Institutions face creepy-crawly cynicism

There is a creepy-crawly and amorphous thing spreading across America.

It is destructive. It demotivates people and denigrates institutions. It sucks up energy, turns moods sour, and promotes anger. It denies hope and encourages distrust.

It is a blanket cynicism, emerging from a swamp of dissatisfaction over Congress and all other public institutions. It is fueled by anger over abortion policy, gun laws, crime and taxes. It is based in fear of economic change. It searches for powerful individuals and groups to blame for all its woes. It is spiteful and mean spirited, sometimes violent. It relies on rhetoric and rumors to make its case.

It is not a new phenomenon, although it takes on different characteristics befitting its time. Today the thing does not respect opposing views. It wants them stifled, preferring censorship to debate. It does not welcome difference but rather embraces similarities glued together by prejudice. Its oracles are politicians, television preachers and radio-talk show hosts.

Former Sen. George McGovern, during another era of a creepy-crawly nature that was filled with political assassinations, campus takeovers and race riots, said: "It is simply untrue that all our institutions are evil, that all adults are unsympathetic, that all politicians are mere opportunists, that aspects of university life are corrupt. Having discovered an illness, it's not terribly useful to prescribe death as a cure." He was right.

Not all public institutions were or are inherently bad. When he spoke those words, students opposed to the Vietnam war had a sincere and defensible position, but when they joined radical forces trying to tear down democracy, they went too far. Their ideas were not a cure for the ills of the nation then. It was a way to kill government.

And even though the civil-rights movement was moral and right, those who set fires and urged armed rebellion were not. They were intent on murdering the institutions they despised, rather than reforming them. The creepy-crawly thing of that time took to the streets. It moved from the national concerns of a nation into the shadows of extreme politics feeding on student emotions.

Today, those fed up with the system are on the other end of the political spectrum. Much of their concern is justifiable. It is based in real problems. It has promise of making necessary changes. But any national movement can become a threat to the Republic when extremes on its fringes take over. Such extremism is manifested today in wild conspiracy theories of U.N. takeovers of America's sovereignty. It is in vile and unfounded accusations that the president bullied political opponents with threatened violence.

It is stoked by the covert racism in anti-welfare diatribes and the overt sexism in the attempt to deny abortion rights no matter what

the circumstances. It is in the formation of paramilitary groups to fend off the boogymean government. When the creepy-crawly thing gets out far enough left or right and attracts enough support, it makes way for a narrow, authoritarian society where everyone agrees or else.

In 1963, President John Kennedy told students at American University in Washington, D.C., to not be blind to differences "but let us also direct attention to our common interests and to the means by which those differences can be resolved. And if we cannot end now our differences, at least we can help make the world safe for diversity."

Diversity is an enemy of the creepy-crawly thing which also fears tolerance, patience, and compassion. The creepy-crawly thing is too obsessed with its own fears and anger to have much time for understanding anyone else's point of view. Creepy-crawly things like secrets, shadows and stealth. They are the mothers of demagogues. The things thrive on darkness.

In the full-blown light of day, however, they lose all their powers. And so, the more Americans encourage debate, participate in public life and speak up for constructive ways to improve this nation's institutions, the less we need worry about creepy-crawly extremism — from either direction — ever demeaning, dominating or destroying democracy.

Mideast powers cited as rights violators

NICOSIA, Cyprus — Governments battling Muslim fundamentalists commonly practice arbitrary arrests and torture, and are the worst violators of human rights in the Middle East, a rights group said Thursday.

Israel, Egypt, Algeria and Saudi Arabia were singled out for the worst abuses, according to the New York-based group Human Rights Watch.

In their showdown with Muslim fundamentalists fighting to overthrow the government, the Egyptian "security apparatus committed abuses with impunity," the group's annual report on the Middle East said.

It accused the Egyptian government of resorting to "extrajudicial executions" in some cases, detaining lawyers and journalists, and dispersing peaceful protests "forcibly, and sometimes violently."

Spanish Communist leader dies at 87

MADRID, Spain — Enrique Lister, a Communist leader and general in the Spanish Civil War, died Thursday. He was 87.

Lister, who underwent surgery for a brain hemorrhage in late November, died at a Madrid hospital after two days in a coma.

Lister fought on the republican side in the 1936-1939 war against Gen. Francisco Franco's nationalist forces. As a colonel, he was praised for his Fifth Regiment's role in the defense of Madrid. He was later promoted to general and was one of the leading figures in the protracted battles along the Ebro river towards the end of the war.

3 die in Muslim extremist attacks

CAIRO, Egypt — Suspected Muslim extremists shot and killed two policemen and a civilian in three separate attacks in the southern city of Mallawi, police said Thursday.

One policeman was killed and another wounded on Thursday as they stood guard at a fire station. A civilian was killed and another wounded when suspected radicals started shooting at random at a city market, police said on condition of anonymity.

An off-duty policeman was killed Wednesday night walking home from work. Mallawi, 160 miles south of Cairo, is the latest battleground for Muslim extremists seeking to replace the secular government with Islamic rule. More than 480 people have died in the violence since 1992.

Kurd politicians imprisoned for gang aid

ANKARA, Turkey — Eight Kurdish politicians were sentenced to prison Thursday for helping armed gangs, but were cleared of treason, a charge punishable by death.

The eight were convicted of aiding Kurdish guerrillas who have been fighting for autonomy in southeast Turkey for 10 years. The violence has killed more than 15,000 people.

The defendants were given prison terms of 3 to 15 years. Yusuf Alatas, a spokesman for 200 lawyers representing the defendants, said they would appeal the verdict.

Palestinian authority issues postage stamp

JERUSALEM — The Palestinian self-rule authority has issued its first postage stamp, showing two holy sites in disputed east Jerusalem. The stamp will be used for internal mail in the autonomous areas of Gaza and Jericho. Palestinian communications minister Abdul Aziz Al-Ashhab said Thursday.

The stamp, worth about 40 U.S. cents, shows the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, where Jesus is said to be buried, and the Dome of the Rock mosque. It also contains the Palestinian flag and the phrase "The Palestinian Authority."

Polish elves elbow their way to German gardens

NOWA SOL, Poland (AP) — The honor of the German garden gnome was at stake.

Hordes of inexpensive Polish-made pretenders were invading across the border, laying siege to a rich German tradition. They had to be stopped.

Thus begins a fairy tale of the new Europe, where cheaper eastern labor and goods threaten established producers in the European Union trade bloc.

Like so many Rumplstiltskins, indignant Poles in this town 60 miles from Germany found a way to spin flax into gold when the communist era ended and the scramble to make a living began.

The German weakness for the garden gnome was well known. That kind of kitsch is all wrapped up in the culture of the land of the Brothers Grimm, where gnomes were first cast from clay 120 years ago.

"A garden gnome was always something that brought quiet to our stressful lives," observes Fritz Friedmann, chairman of the International Association for the Protection of Garden Gnomes.

German folklore has cast the tiny creatures — placed strategically in gardens like the pink flamingos that adorn some American lawns — as

devious prankster to hard-working miner, to guardian of the earth's secrets.

But even Gnome Museum proprietor Guenter Griebel can't explain exactly how the little ceramic fellows came about — and his great-grandfather was among the German craftsmen who first forged the figures around 1870.

Meanwhile, across the border in Nowa Sol, in dozens of garages and barns, relatives and neighbors in 1990 began churning out jolly white-bearded dwarves with pointed caps in plaster and plastic.

Some were originals. But plenty were wretchedly copied German designs, standards like the musket-toting Hunter, or the post-modern favorite, coat-flung-open Flasher.

Along major highway approaches to Germany, scores of dwarf stands sprouted overnight like toadstools after a rain.

German tourists snapped up the cheap Polish gnomes, and before long they were for sale in garden stores across Germany about one-fourth the price of their German relations which can cost up to the equivalent of \$120.

A battle cry issued from German makers: Call out the customs guards!

German gnome makers declared

war, and secured court orders protecting more than 200 varieties of the creatures, anywhere from 8 inches to 2 feet tall.

In August, seizures began. Customs guards, armed with binders full of photographs of patented German dwarfs, unloaded trucks, unwrapped gnomes and singled out offenders. Hundreds of the creatures were confiscated and smashed into powder.

Michael Pieczkolan, the original Polish gnome producer, cut production and began diversifying into plump ceramic sailor boys and fiber-glass shepherds.

"But Nowa Sol without garden gnomes that would be tragic," he said.

Governor sworn amid rebel threats

TUXTLA GUTIERREZ, Mexico (AP) — Amid threats of violence and charges of vote fraud, the ruling party's candidate was sworn in Thursday as governor of troubled Chiapas state.

"I vow to take upon the duties of the constitution," Eduardo Robledo Rincon said to loud applause at the National Theater, where President Ernesto Zedillo and 200 lawmakers attended the ceremony.

A rebel group that took over several towns in the state last January had said Robledo's inauguration would void an 11-month cease-fire. There were no immediate reports of violence.

The threat posed the first crisis for the week-old government of Zedillo, who has pledged to reform Mexico's political system. Zedillo's Institutional Revolutionary Party has governed the country for 65 years.

Zedillo gave Robledo a bear hug after the ceremony in the modern steel and glass theater, several blocks from the statehouse where a crowd of Indian and peasant protesters swelled to 3,000 this morning.

Drivers' education

Twin Falls police take to school buses to spot violations

TWIN FALLS — Cpl. Dennis Reinhart deals with drunken drivers, misfired speeders, frustrating traffic pile-ups and wounded accident victims for a living.

But Thursday might have been his toughest day on the force.

Seated at the front of a bus load of screaming school children, Reinhart watched out the window for drivers who, ignoring traffic laws, pass the school bus while children get on and off.

It was a test run for what may become a larger crackdown by the Twin Falls Police Department on traffic violations around school buses. What seems like a minor offense can have major consequences, Reinhart said.

"Apparently there have been quite a few problems," Reinhart said. "I think this needs to become a regular thing."

As far as he knows, there haven't been any schoolchildren hit by cars while leaving the bus. But he knows there have been plenty of violators, Reinhart said.

"It's one of those things where unless you follow a school bus around all day, you're not going to catch them," he said.

As children boarded the yellow bus, Reinhart fielded their questions and took in their curious stares. Kathy Dorsey, the bus driver, armed with only an intercom, tried to control the kids.

It was a change of pace for Reinhart, who had volunteered to patrol the school bus on his day off. Before the ride, Reinhart said he didn't know if he had the stamina.

"I always thought when I was a kid that riding on a school bus is okay, but I could never drive one," he said.

In the loading zone at Harrison School, Reinhart noticed that a woman had driven her car across the street and parked it in front of the bus facing the wrong way. He radioed his partner, Officer Steve Collins, who had been following the bus.

Collins drove from his spot around the block and wrote the woman a ticket. She had told him that she was picking up her children, and that she had always parked that way at the school, Collins said.

Part of the problem is that people forget about

the laws regarding school buses, Reinhart said. For example, when a school bus brakes and the blinking stop signs flap open, all traffic — even in the opposite lane — must stop, he said.

The Idaho State Police has been patrolling this way for many years, Reinhart said. People get more lax after Christmas break and in autumn when school begins again and forget about school bus traffic laws, he said.

"We're pretty fortunate," Reinhart said. "We don't have that many pedestrian accidents. Yet."



Banks pitch offers to E911 board

TWIN FALLS — The regional "enhanced" 911 board is banking on a multi-year lending plan to pay for \$3.6 million in equipment and other expenses.

Representatives from Key Bank, WestOne Bank and BankOne were in Twin Falls Thursday to make formal presentations to the four-county E911 board.

Six financial lenders were set to bid for the project, but two banks bailed out because of scheduling conflicts. The third — First Interstate Bank of Idaho — reconsidered and declined to make an offer.

The board, representing Jerome, Gooding, Lincoln and Twin Falls counties, has raised enough money through its \$1 monthly phone surcharge to pay for a \$900,000 emergency dispatch center near Jerome.

But the just-completed building remains empty because the board still needs money to pay for the computer database and other miscellaneous dispatching equipment for the E911 system.

Enhanced 911 service allows dispatchers to obtain detailed emergency information about 911 calls and track the location of the caller. Basic 911 service only provides a

toll-free emergency phone number.

WestOne Bank is offering to issue bonds, in an amount between \$3.5 and \$4 million, with the E911 board paying back its debt over a period of 15 to 20 years. Interest would accrue at a fixed rate.

BankOne also would offer a long-term plan for the board to pay off the loan in 15 years. But the interest payments would be based on a "floating" rate that changes every three to five years.

"Key (Bank) isn't even talking about issuing bonds," said Jerome County Commissioner Veronica Lierman. "They're just giving us a straight loan."

Whatever plan the board picks — bonds or loan — the monthly \$1 phone surcharge would pay it back.

Twin Falls County Commissioner and E911 Chairman Marvin Hempleman said the board needs to decide on a lending plan so it can take it before a judge to be validated. That judicial confirmation process, which is estimated to take 30 days once it begins, was required by

The next regular E911 board meeting is Dec. 21.

But E911 attorney Leon Smith said the board is calling a special meeting next week to pick its lending bank.

"If nothing gets thrown in the way, it's at least a two-month process" to start the court proceedings, Smith said.

Batt proposes \$3 million for water rights adjudication

BOISE — Gov.-elect Phil Batt said Thursday that he will propose spending up to \$3 million to keep the Snake River Basin water rights adjudication alive for another year even though he questions the value of the process in light of an adverse court ruling.

"I'll support some sort of funding, but I don't believe we need to open the state coffers and have it all," Batt said. He added, however, that the adverse court decision may justify delaying any major advancement of the adjudication process for a year or two until the legal issues are worked out.

"We're tentatively looking at holding this appropriation down to some nominal figure," Batt said, agreeing that it would be in the \$1 million to \$3 million range.

Lawmakers had indicated the state would probably have to pump \$4 million to \$5 million into the process to keep it running after the existing money is used up in June.

A day earlier, 5th District Judge Daniel Hurlburt of Twin Falls declared unconstitutional most of the ground rules for the determination of some 150,000 water rights in southern, central and north central Idaho.

Of the adjudication's \$4.3 million annual budget, only \$910,000 is earmarked for Hurlburt's court in Twin Falls. Hurlburt is the presiding judge in the state's water court.

The remaining \$3.4 million is earmarked

for the Idaho Department of Water Resources, which investigates and assembles water claims.

Hurlburt said lawmakers violated the separation of powers doctrine by interfering in a pending lawsuit that the state was a party to and interfering with the powers of the courts.

Key components of the legislative package removed the Water Resources Department director as a party to the adjudication lawsuits, making him an independent expert and elevating his findings on disputed water claims above the status of themselves. It also immunized the state from paying attorneys' fees for water rights claimants in an overall attempt to end the adversarial relationship between the state and the court and try to settle claims disputes outside the courtroom.

In releasing his decision, Hurlburt said he was initiating his own claims mediation program.

Both Batt and retiring Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus, promising an appeal, warned that if the ruling stood it would cost the state millions of dollars more to complete the adjudication — money the state cannot afford.

The process has already lasted eight years and cost over \$20 million — money paid by water rights claimants — but legislators say it could cost another \$40 million, this time from taxpayers, before it is completed a decade from now.

Marvel bids \$15,000 extra for lease

BOISE — Environmentalist Jon Marvel lost a bid to acquire a state land lease, but claimed victory anyway.

Marvel, a Hailey architect and founder of a group that hopes to curtail livestock grazing on state lands, said even though a rancher retained the right to the 10-year lease, the auction Tuesday at the Department of Lands regional office in Boise proved two important points.

"This shows that ranchers are willing to pay more to graze cattle on state land and it suggests that the state is not charging market rates for these leases," Marvel said.

Higher bids, if accepted by the state Land Board, mean more

money for schools.

The lease, for 8,000 acres of prime Elmore County rangeland, was retained by Grand View cattleman Lloyd Law, who offered a top bid of \$15,050. Two other ranchers and Marvel also participated in the auction.

Law, whose family-run ranch has grazed Black Angus and Hereford cattle on the land for nine years, said later that he spent more than planned, but the land is a vital part of his business. It's 20 miles north of Mountain Home.

One rancher stopped bidding at \$3,300. Marvel stopped at \$8,000. Erin Lord, a neighbor of Law's who also wanted the land for cattle grazing, declined to go higher than \$15,000.

The Idaho Watersheds Project,

founded by Marvel last year, is a nonprofit group trying to obtain state land leases, most of which are held by ranchers.

At auctions over the past three weeks, Marvel won the right to lease 1,120 acres of state land, including a 640-acre parcel that had been leased by billionaire industrialist J.R. Simpson.

However, Marvel's winning bids may not last. They must be approved by the state Land Board, made up of five state officials. Last year, the board changed an earlier decision and rejected Marvel's high bid for 640 acres in Custer County.

Marvel's goal is to remove livestock from the range and then restore streams he says have been degraded by cattle and sheep.

FAA probes pilot confusion at Salt Lake

FAA probes pilot confusion at Salt Lake

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The Federal Aviation Administration is looking into a series of incidents where airlines have mistakenly taken off from a Salt Lake International airport runway reserved for small aircraft.

KUTV News reported Thursday it had discovered five incidents where large jet planes used the small plane runway, which is roughly half the length of two other runways set aside for the big air carriers.

In the past month alone, FAA records show two pilots took off from the shorter runway. About a week ago, a plane

owned by Berry Aviation of Austin, Texas, took off from the strip.

Andrus warns tax cut could trigger hikes elsewhere

BOISE (AP) — Retiring Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus again blasted proposals for a major tax reduction Thursday, warning Republicans and Democratic tax cutters alike that they are inviting increases in other taxes.

In one of the final speeches of his unprecedented four terms in office, Andrus told the Boise Downtown Rotary Club that a property and state tax cut in the range of \$40 million to \$75 million has been discussed by GOP Gov.-elect Phil Batt and House Speaker Michael Simpson could ruin the financial balance the state has built over the past eight years.

"The state's revenue stream is sufficient to meet the critical needs of education and the other important state services government must provide, that you expect and demand," Andrus said. "But if we attempt to give away the state's revenue stream we will do it at our own peril."

"Massive tax relief sounds

good, and with smoke and mirrors you can get by in

1995," he said. "But after that it could get painful."

In the forum Andrus has used over the past two terms to make major policy declarations, the governor warned that problems will loom beyond 1995 when cash surpluses no longer exist and now-rust economic growth weakens.

"In Idaho, we have always done business by the pay-as-you-go method, and it has worked," Andrus said. "I believe our leaders actually risk a tax increase — something we haven't had in my last eight years in office — if they act hastily and give away the revenue stream that we have worked so very hard to create."

Andrus, who vetoed a huge property tax cut last spring because he feared it spelled financial disaster, said the current revenue structure could support a small amount of property tax relief, but not at the levels Batt and others have discussed. That amount, he said, would require sales tax revenues to be increased, probably through extending the levy to currently untaxed items like services, as an offset.

"I keep reading about \$40 million, \$60 million, \$80 million, \$70 million," he said. "It's crazy." Batt is committed to \$40 million and property tax reduction statewide — the beginning of a four-year plan to eliminate property tax financing for basic school operations. Simpson has weighed in with a proposal for another \$35 million in corporate and individual income tax cuts to quell business concerns that the property tax reduction will only mean higher state taxes for them.

Andrus most proud of increase school funding

BOISE (AP) — If he had to pick a single accomplishment in his record-setting 14 years as Idaho's governor, Cecil Andrus says it would be the huge increase in school funding he helped engineer.

He said Thursday he's proud of getting statewide kindergartens in Idaho and bringing technology into the classroom.

"I would say in education ... the area of appropriations has to be probably the most important thing," he said.

Andrus was interviewed on

Thursday night. A statewide audience was invited to grill Andrus, but he got few hard questions from callers.

Andrus said he also likes to recall his accomplishments in four years as Interior secretary under President Jimmy Carter. He mentioned the Alaska wilderness bill, changes in the surface management act and rangeland improvement.

"Some of those things were very important to me," he said. He wouldn't talk about his low points.

"I've never been much to dwell

on the low points and the losses." We've had those, but in my business, if you aren't the eternal optimist, you're in the wrong game," the governor said. "I gave it my best shot."

He said he has few regrets as he prepares to leave office in a little more than three weeks.

"We have a strong economy. We have a high quality of life and we are the envy of the entire world. So as I leave this office, I am very comfortable with what we have been able to accomplish," Andrus said.

"This is not a good use of taxpayer money," Batt said. "I don't know where we're going on this. I'm certainly disappointed."

Hurlbut has spent very little of the money. Most of it has gone to the Department of Water Resources.

Simply stopping the adjudication is an option, Batt said, and he

would not necessarily guarantee that water rights claimants would be repaid the more than \$20 million they have paid so far for the determination of the priority of their water rights.

Andrus had earlier expressed his dissatisfaction with Hurlbut's ruling even though he had expressed serious reservations about the leg-

islative package after it was rammed through the House and Senate during the waning hours of the 1994 session. At that time, Andrus said that was a poor way of handling complicated issues like water law and speculated that serious legal problems would emerge that would only make work for attorneys.

Albion Council denies water, sewer, power to mobile homes

ALBION — The City Council will deny power, sewer and water for mobile homes within Albion city limits for the next 180 days.

The moratorium also denies tie-down permits and mobile home park permits while the City Council develops a comprehensive plan for zoning and development.

Mayor Donald Danner said the moratorium would ensure mobile homes are placed in identified areas and with a specific plan for zoning.

The council also reviewed the development of two other properties.

Danner discussed a 12-unit motel on the commercial corridor of Main Street that has been approved by the

Cassia County Planning and Zoning Commission.

The motel was approved without the usual public hearing because Albion doesn't have a comprehensive zoning plan. The developer has met the existing county ordinances that Albion has adopted while it develops its own plan.

On the advice of City Attorney Steven Bywater, Danner said he will suggest the developer hold an informational meeting. Danner and City Councilman Tom John said that the developer has agreed to work with the city and the public to keep the motel compatible with the city's architecture and landscaping.

City Council members also briefly discussed a 10-home subdivision site, one mile south of Albion city

limits, that has been approved by the county zoning commission.

Danner said he has been working with an industrial group that has expressed an interest in the property of Southern Idaho College of Education-Albion State Normal School and restoring the buildings.

Danner expects a proposal by mid-February or March. He also said that the industrial group seems reputable and is one of the few interested parties that has money.

Council members discussed the progress of a proposal to transfer the school to the state to turn it into a state park. Uses being considered for the property are for a recreational vehicle park, a folk life center, and an educational field institute. The city council agreed to continue to

look into this possibility.

But Danner said that it might be in the city's best interest to retain ownership. Under city ownership, the school can still qualify for grant aid.

In other business, the council:

- Approved a new Albion city management structure plan.
- Approved spending \$4,550 on a new computer system.
- Approved several beer licenses contingent upon the businesses submitting the proper paperwork.

- Reviewed the status of a pre-application for a block grant to upgrade the city's electrical system. Danner said that the city will know in three weeks whether Albion's been invited to make a full-fledged application. Grant recipients will be notified by mid-March.

Sierra is in stable condition at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center in Boise, a hospital spokesperson said. She was admitted to the hospital over Thanksgiving weekend with head injuries. Doctors believe Sierra will be blind for the rest of her life and are uncertain of long-term brain damage, Minidoka County Prosecutor Gara Newman said.

Justice Department won't charge agents in standoff

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department has ruled out criminal charges against federal agents in the shooting death of white separatist Randy Weaver's wife during a 1992 standoff in Idaho.

A department task force investigated the shooting of Vicki Weaver by an FBI sharpshooter and the orders under which he operated. But the set of state's civil rights division reviewed the task force report and decided against bringing criminal charges against any federal agents involved in the case. Myron Marlin, spokesman for the division, said Wednesday.

The New York Times reported Thursday that Deval Patrick, the assistant attorney general in

charge of the civil rights division, said in an Oct. 15 memorandum that the agents had a reasonable belief that their lives were in danger when the sharpshooter fired the fatal shot.

Patrick said the agents did not intentionally use excessive force, the Times reported.

The use of excessive force by law enforcement officers can be a civil rights violation.

The 11-day siege in the summer of 1992 began when U.S. marshals went to Weaver's northern Idaho mountain cabin to arrest him on a weapons charge. A marshal and Weaver's teen-age son were killed in a shootout, and Weaver, his wife and others remained holed up in the cabin.

The FBI hostage rescue team was

called to the scene and encircled the Weaver cabin. A sniper shot and wounded Weaver when he and another man emerged from the cabin. The sniper fired again as the two retreated, but the bullet struck and killed Mrs. Weaver, who was standing unarmed in the doorway holding the couple's infant daughter.

Weaver later was acquitted of killing the marshal.

Following the trial, a 24-member team of investigators concluded in their report — still officially secret — that FBI officials and the paramilitary team had mishandled the affair and recommended that Justice lawyers consider prosecution, the Times said.

However, it said the Justice Department's Office of Professional

Responsibility disagreed with the finding, and its Civil Rights Division held there were insufficient grounds to charge the sniper or anyone else with a crime.

The department and the FBI have not decided whether there will be any administrative discipline for those involved.

The Times said the critical task force report, while not made public, has been circulated among the FBI and other law-enforcement agencies.

It said FBI Director Louis J. Freeh has not said what he plans to do concerning the report, but has made several changes in how the agency's team responds, and has named Larry A. Potts, who was in charge of the Idaho operation, to be his deputy.

BELLINGHAM, Wash. (AP) — A drug-possession charge against Chevy Chase's driver, accused of picking up a delivery of prescription painkillers at Bellingham International Airport last summer, has been dismissed.

Fred W. Moroz, 49, of Richmond, British Columbia, had been charged with possessing a prescription drug with intent to deliver.

Moroz said he was transporting the painkillers for Chase. Moroz said the actor-comedian ordered the painkillers because he was having difficulty filling the prescription in Canada, where he was filming a movie.

Weekend Scourge of the skeeters

Idahoan Patrick McManus can spin a fly and a tale.

TWIN FALLS — Patrick McManus wants you to know that if you assembled a panel of experts — perhaps two raccoons, a skunk, a porcupine, some squirrels and a beaver would be appropriate — to sit along the side of a stream and judge his fly-casting prowess, they'd be unimpressed.

"I'm not a good caster," said the Idaho-bred humorist in a telephone interview from his Spokane, Wash., home Thursday. "But that doesn't make me feel too bad because you can teach somebody to cast in a day. What's the purpose of fly-fishing, anyway? To look great or to catch fish?"

At 60, McManus has been pointing out the pratfalls of mankind and quite a few women in the great outdoors for 26 years — first as a columnist for Field & Stream magazine, then as a best-selling author working on his 11th book and his 5 millionth reader.

His latest offering, "How I Got This Way," was published by Henry Holt & Co. in October. It's a rumination on how a kid from Bonner County got invited to go hiking with President Bush — and got lost in the process.

"It's quite true," McManus said. "I had a roll of film in my fanny pack and the Secret Service stopped me to check it, and when I looked up, all the reporters who were present for this photo opportunity had disappeared down another trail."

"Fortunately, there was a Secret Service agent behind every tree. Some of the trees were Secret Service agents."

McManus, you see, is one of those people whose things seem to happen to.

"One thing I've learned about humor is that it's never quite so funny as when your situation is almost hopeless," McManus told People magazine in 1988. "The very fact that life turns out badly cancels the significance of anything anybody does. You're dealing with an absurdity, and the humor arises out of that absurdity."

McManus also gets a lot of mileage out of the uneasy relationship between Mother Nature and people trying to get close enough to give it a big hug.

"There are a lot of people in the outdoors who will sit down against a tree when it's 10 above having no idea that there's a good chance they won't get up again," he said. "Whenever I drive through the country during the winter, I look out

the window and think, 'Could I survive overnight out there?' And you know, I think I could."

But he's most celebrated for his characters — country rubes who are too clever by half and still a couple of chubs shy of their limit.

"That comes from growing up in a small town," said McManus, reared in the Priest River Valley, the son of a widowed schoolteacher. "In a small town, everybody knows everybody else's business because of that wonderful thing called gossip. It's a great place to meet characters."

McManus' other great influence was radio.

"Radio was all there was then, and it's a great medium for storytelling. Every time Fibber McGee opened his closet, the content came crashing out. It was hilarious every time. But if you showed the same thing on

television, it wouldn't have been funny."

McManus says radio also taught him how effectively timing, irony and dialects could be in making people laugh.

"There are very few things I read now that can make me laugh out loud — none that I can think of, with the exception of (humorist) Jean Shepard," he said. "But radio always could."

McManus is working on developing a syndicated radio program that borrows heavily from the style of "Fibber McGee

and Molly" and "Jack Benny." That would follow on the heels of a one-man stage show, starring Spokane actor Tim Beltrami, that toured nationally last year, including a stop in Twin Falls.

"But it's an expensive proposition," he said. "So we'll see what happens."

In the meantime, he scours the outback for material ("I think I've written about everything, even forked sticks — three times"), and considers a safari.

"Maybe that's what I need to do," he said. "I think I've written about everything you can find outdoors in Idaho."

Including, of course, the city-bred newcomers who are changing the sylvan Panhandle of his youth — and changing it forever.

"When I was growing up, (Sundpoint) didn't even have a bookstore," he said. "Now it has espresso bars. That's certainly a symptom of decline."

'Junior': Anatomy of why a supposedly sure thing went belly-up

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. (AP) — Arnold Schwarzenegger's "Junior" hadn't even played its first weekend and already the Friday morning buzz at Marjoe's Deli was that the comedy was dead.

Between bites of scrambled egg whites at the Brentwood movie industry hangout, one Academy Award-winning producer said with surprise that the earliest ticket sales just weren't there. A senior production executive sipping cappuccino across the room was equally perplexed: The season's sure-fire hit was shooting blanks.

"Junior" had opened on Thanksgiving eve, and before the leftover cranberries and stuffing were cooling in the refrigerator, it looked like the highly touted comedy was going to be a box-office turkey. Universal Pictures still maintains the film may eventually gross \$100 million in domestic theaters, but industry analysts say "Junior" might not even pass \$30 million.

The weak returns are remarkable primarily because "Junior" was considered the holiday's slam-dunk smash.

"The film seemed to have an easily communicated, can't-miss comedy hook: Action-star Schwarzenegger pregnant! Ads of his inflated belly were everywhere.

Matinee hero Schwarzenegger and Danny DeVito, whose pairing in 1988's "Twins" earned \$111.7 million, were back together.

Ivan Reitman ("Ghostbusters," "Kindergarten Cop," "Dave"), the town's most consistently popular comedy director, was at the helm. His pacing was brisk, and the jokes seemed to click. Preview screenings were filled with raucous laughter.

Early notices and word-of-mouth were overwhelmingly positive. Vari-

ety's rave review said "Junior" would take "the seasonal box-office crown." A former studio chief predicted it would be the highest-grossing winter release.

So what happened? Oddly enough, the can't-miss premise itself appears to have missed: Male viewers were turned off by a movie about a pregnant man. To many,

the concept was simply unpalatable. Men don't see the humor in pregnancy — especially when it's a man who's with child.

The marketing campaign, which pushed the pregnancy angle hard, was now the film's worst advertisement.

(In the film, Schwarzenegger's character is artificially inseminated by obstetrician DeVito as part of a futuristic science experiment. He eventually gives birth to a baby by Caesarean section.)

Days before the film opened Nov. 23, Reitman was nervous. The Universal marketing department was concerned, too: Test screenings showed women were more interested in "Junior" than men, and some men weren't interested at all.

Such a gender imbalance can work for a romance, such as "Sleepless in Seattle" or "Four Weddings and a Funeral." But if men aren't interested in a Schwarzenegger flick — well, imagine a Disney animated musical that didn't appeal to kids.

"Everybody thought it was a problem," said one executive close to the film. "But they thought the quality of the film would overcome it."

It hasn't so far. After its debut weekend, in which "Junior" made \$13.4 million and finished no better than fourth, the movie saw its box-office grosses slip 62 percent last weekend, when it made \$3.2 million. Its total gross through Monday was \$20.3 million. All films were down sharply from the Thanksgiving weekend, but "Junior" lost more of its audience than the lightly regarded

"A Low Down Dirty Shame." Tellingly, "Junior" is playing especially poorly in the South, where "A Low Down Dirty Shame" and "The Santa Clause" are performing better. The more conservative the market, the worse "Junior" seems to do.

Screenwriter Chris Conrad, who conceived the "Junior" story and shares a writing credit with Kevin Wade, says

it's understandable that some people are resistant to "Junior." The concept, she says, "is really a test for men" and "a shock." "The ones who are secure go easily. The ones who are not secure don't," she said. "It is a new concept, and people are afraid of the new. ... It's a controversial idea. There is a serious side to it, which I think is good."

Regarding the first piece set for the performance, Neiwirth said, "The Rondo is a favorite. It is a showy piece from an era gone by."

Written by Chopin when he was 15, Neiwirth feels "it shows the potential for his mastery of the piano."

Next up is Rachmaninoff. "It is unusual in that it explores the subtle aspects of the piano," and because of this "stands alone in piano literature," Neiwirth said.

Of the Ravel number, he said, "The orchestration of the piece is considered of the highest and most imaginative of the 20th

century composers. It is colorful and flashy, difficult to perform. It explores capabilities of the piano I've rarely seen."

Neiwirth said the benefit, which raises scholarship money for young musicians to use on their education, will be special for him.

"The scholarship money available to me when I was young helped me to grow as a musician," he said.

"By the time musicians finish their masters' program, they have spent more on their education than a medical doctor would on his," said Martha Mead, president of the music club.

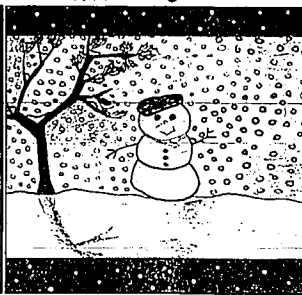
TWIN FALLS — Ellen Feusahrens' drawing is going to find its way on to fireplace mantles and business windows all over Idaho this month.

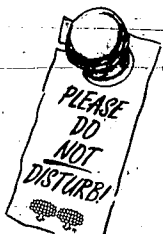

TV march to movies continues with Gibson's 'Maverick'

"Maverick" (PG) Last year, Warner Bros. struck a bonanza with a brilliant update of the old David Janssen TV series "The Fugitive." Now, the company presents another revision of a TV classic, "Maverick."

The elements seem surefire: a well-loved title character; three appealing stars; a director of hits, Richard Donner ("Lethal Weapon"); a reliable writer, William Goldman ("Butch Cassidy, and the Sundance Kid"); chases and shootouts; and amid glorious scenery, and a rich score.

With such a compelling package, why does "Maverick" leave you with the sense of having consumed a low-calorie meal?

The film opens promisingly enough: Mel Gibson as Bret Maverick seated atop a skittish horse, his neck in a noose. Four desperadoes abandon him in the desert to a certain hanging as his mind flashes back to how he got in this mess.

Gibson saunters into a Western town in search of suckers to help provide the entry fee for a big money poker tournament aboard the paddle-wheeler LaRue Belle. The companions in his first game include Jodie Foster as the wily Annabelle Bransford and Alfred Molina as a shady gambler. Gibson wins the pot, and his troubles begin, both from the vengeful Molina and the pick-pocket Foster.

Gibson and Foster share a stagecoach ride out of town with a tight-lipped lawman, Zane Cooper, played by James Garner. They embark on a series of adventures, including surviving a runaway stagecoach, rescuing a plundered wagon train, and encounters with Indians.

Yes, Gibson does escape the hanging. The rest of the story concerns the poker tournament, conducted with great style by "Commodore" James Coburn.

Goldman's script contains a labyrinth of deceptions, tricks, hoaxes and revelations, including a major one at the end. This is accompanied by continual banter among the three principals, and it becomes a bit-tired, especially Foster's joking references to Gibson as "Bert."

Nor does Donner's handling of the events seem inspired. The Indian sequence is embarrassing, especially for the usually dignified Graham Greene.

With his sly humor, Gibson is the best possible candidate for Bret Maverick, though he seems braver than Garner's original, a self-confessed coward. Foster

skillfully manages the change of pace as a frontier temptress. Garner is always a pleasure to watch, even when he plays second gun.

Vilmos Zsigmond deserves special applause for his photography of the stunning landscapes of Glen Canyon National Park and Kanab, Utah, (Associated Press) (Video West, Blockbuster)

"Fortunes of War" (PG-13). Martin Sheen, who nearly died in the Philippines while making "Apocalypse Now," returned there to play a supporting role in this drama about the Thailand adventures of a disillusioned American relief worker (Matt Salingor) and his old friend (Dr. Haing S. Rock of ages continues to draw most fans

When the Rolling Stones tour started, there were worries that time was no longer on their side.

But despite some heavy competition, the Stones are likely to end 1994 as the year's top concert draw in North America, according to two concert industry trade publications.

When their U.S. tour ends on Dec. 18, the Stones will have earned an estimated \$119.4 million, *Performance* magazine said.

That total doesn't count four shows where the band didn't report its earnings because of slow ticket sales. More than 2 million people have seen the Stones this year.

"They're still incredible performers," said

Jane Cohen, senior editor of *Performance*, on Friday. "They're still the premiere rock 'n' roll band. But I don't think you're going to see them tour at this level again."

Ticket sales for the Stones' tour were initially slow, but that was largely because there was so much competition on the road, said Gary Bongiovanni, editor of *Pollstar*, which will also report the Stones as top earners.

Pink Floyd, which lumbers along despite internal strife and poorly received albums, drew more than 3 million fans and earned \$104.6 million, *Performance* said.

Billy Joel performed before nearly 2 million people and earned \$75.8 million to finish third, followed by the Eagles.

You're racing against the clock — and against a security robot — this is a tense, difficult, photorealistic game; the probe is unarmed so there's no fighting, just ingenuity.

Good points, bad points: Excellent graphics on Sega CD, which looks as good as the PC and Macintosh version. Game play is the same, but with out the keyboard controls it's hard to access things on screen. If you have played the PC or MAC version, forget how you controlled your probe — you must relearn with the control pad.

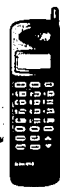

'Drop Zone' free falls into the mundane

"Drop Zone" takes a literal view of the high concept movie, with skydivers — some of whom seem to regard a parachute as a wimpy luxury — jumping recklessly from their planes. Their stunts defy gravity as much as John Badham's movie direction defies common sense.

Since Andrew Bergman regaled us with that unforgettable cascade of skydiving-Elvis impersonators in the hilarious finale to "Honey, We Shrunk Ourselves," "Drop Zone" presents him to the high-tech fascinations that yielded such flashy entertainments as "Blitz," "Thunder," and "WarGames." As you would expect, "Drop Zone" is dizzyingly effective when it's up in the air and plodding and far-fetched when it is forced to come down to earth and attend to such mundane matters as plot and plausible motive.

The screenplay has the jerky rhythm and progressively sillier

developments that suggest its writers were stuck with the thankless task of coming up with a story to fit the not very lofty concept of skydiving narco-terrorists and the cops who pursue them above the clouds. In this case, high concept reaches all too often to the heights of absurdity.

The opening of the movie aboard a Boeing 747 amounts to fair warning. Here Wesley Snipes, looking as if he never stepped off the plane from "Passenger 57," is once again in the middle of an airborne crisis. He is a federal marshal — as is his brother. The prisoner they are escorting is kidnapped in mid-

flight, but nobody in authority believes Pete Nespis's (Snipes) interpretation of the ensuing blood-bath and how the gangsters escaped.

On suspension, where all good burned-out cop movies start, Nespis becomes a maverick investigator bent on finding the crooks whose actions killed his brother. The kidnapper is a computer whiz, and he has been whisked away by a devious psycho named Ty Moncrieff (Gary Busey).

Busey has done this homicidal rant so often, he could mail it in. But the man does have energy, and there is a certain masochistic pleasure in watching an actor chew the scenery while dangling at 15,000 feet.

To anyone paying attention to the towering discrepancies in "Drop Zone" — not a pastime I would recommend — it will be obvious that there are easier ways to spring a prisoner than commandeering a jetliner.

But they are also less spectacular.

Snipes, who has some fun with the tough cop's understandably high anxiety about stepping out of an airplane, is not on the ground, does his best to listen up what is strictly police routine. We are asked to credit the idea that the DEA keeps the names of its undercover agents in a computer whose defenses can be penetrated by a hacker in minutes.

Moncrieff and his jumpy band of hoods plan to land on the roof of the DEA building and sell the stolen names to drug barons. "Drop Zone" may drop any signs of intelligence early, but fans of ritz stunt work and those with no fear of heights or tendency to vertigo will enjoy it anyway. Badham is far better in this field when he has a theme around which to wrap the suspense (nuclear paranoia in "WarGames") and privacy and police surveillance in "Blue Thunder." "Drop Zone" isn't about anything in particular, but it leaves the head spinning so fast that no one is likely to notice. (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

Thriller 'discloses' little new with Douglas

Danny DeVito and Emma Thompson are suitably impressed, but the film manages to work up a comic head of steam, never managing to be more than lightly amusing. "The Lion King" (G). The sidekicks steal the show in this animated extravaganza from Disney. A worthy successor to "Beauty and the Beast" and "Aladdin," but without as much magic.

'Drop Zone' free falls into the mundane

"Drop Zone" takes a literal view of the high concept movie, with skydivers — some of whom seem to regard a parachute as a wimpy luxury — jumping recklessly from their planes. Their stunts defy gravity as much as John Badham's movie cheerfully defies sense.

Since Andrew Bergman regaled us with that unforgettable cascade of skydiving Elvies impersonators in the hilarious finale to "Honey, We Shrunk in Vegas," the sport's possibilities in action films have surely been curtailed. That consideration hasn't fazed Badham, and "Drop Zone" returns him to the high-tech fascinations that yielded such flashy entertainments as "Bliss" and "WarGames." As you would expect, "Drop Zone" is only as effective when it's up in the air and plodding and far-fetched when it is forced to come down to earth and attend to such mundane matters as plot and plausible motive.

The screenplay has the jerky rhythm and progressively sillier

developments that suggest its writers were stuck with the thankless task of coming up with a story to fit the not very jolly concept of skydiving narcissists and the cops who pursue them above the clouds. In this case, high concept reaches all too often to the heights of absurdity.

The opening of the movie aboard a Boeing 747 amounts to fair warning: Here Wesley Snipes, looking as if he never stepped off the plane from "Passenger 57," is once again in the middle of an airborne crisis. He is a federal marshal — as is his brother. The prisoner they are escorting is kidnapped in mid-

flight, but nobody in authority believes Pete Nappi's (Snipes) interpretation of the ensuing blood-bath and how the gangsters escaped.

On suspension, where all good burned-out cop movies start, Nappi becomes a maverick investigator bent on finding the crooks whose actions killed his brother. The kidnapping is a computer whiz, and he has been whisked away by a devious psycho named Ty Monieriff (Gary Bussey).

Bussey has done this homicidal rant so often, he could mail it in. But the man does have energy, and there is a certain masochistic pleasure in watching an actor chew the scenery while dangling at 15,000 feet.

To anyone paying attention to the towering discrepancies in "Drop Zone" — not a pastime I would recommend — it will be obvious that there are easier ways to spring a prisoner than commandeering a jetliner.

But they are also less spectacular.

Snipes, who has some fun with the tough cop's understandingly high anxiety about stepping out of an airplane that is not on the ground, does his best to live up to what is strictly police routine. We are asked to credit the idea that the DEA keeps the names of its undercover agents in a computer whose defenses can be penetrated by a hacker in minutes.

Monieriff and his jumpy band of hoodlums plan to land on the roof of the DEA building and sell the stolen names to drug barons. "Drop Zone" may drop any signs of intelligence early, but fans of ritz stunt work and those with no fear of heights or tendency to vertigo will enjoy it anyway. Badham is far better in this field when he has a theme around which to wrap the suspense (nuclear paranoia in "WarGames" and privacy and police surveillance in "Blue Thunder"). "Drop Zone" isn't about anything in particular, but it leaves the head spinning so fast that no one is likely to notice. (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

Thriller 'discloses' little new with Douglas

"Junior" (PG-13). The prototypical American studio comedy, as slickly commercial as the audience-pleasing director Ivan Reitman can make it. Arnold Schwarzenegger stars as a man who becomes pregnant. Danny DeVito and Emma Thompson are suitably impressed, but the film, unable to work up a comic head of steam, never manages to be more than lightly amusing. "The Lion King" (G). The sidekick steal the show in this animated extravaganza from Disney. A worthy successor to "Beauty and the Beast" and "Aladdin," but without as much magic.

NBC fires back at Fox; contests acquisition of Wisconsin station

WASHINGTON — NBC fired another regulatory jab at rival Fox, formally contesting the emerging network's plan to take away an affiliate in Wisconsin.

NBC filed a petition with the Federal Communications Commission Wednesday, asking it to block the acquisition of WLUX-TV, Green Bay, by Fox and partner Savoy Pictures Entertainment Inc. The petition was made public Thursday.

The acquisition, NBC said, violates FCC rules limiting the number of stations one broadcaster can own nationally to 12 and limiting to 25 percent the amount of equity a foreign company can take in a U.S. broadcaster.

NBC raised the same issues before the FCC in August, but stopped short of filing a formal petition against the acquisition.

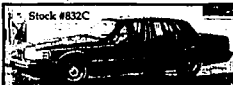

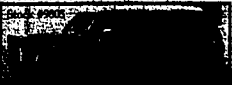

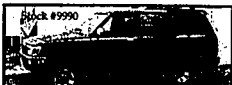

THE ACES ON BRIDGE

South's play of today's diamond suit fueled much controversy. South claimed he went with the odds in playing for a drop; North argued South should have finessed. Both overlooked South's actual mistake. Follow the play to see if you can spot when and where South went wrong.

South took the opening lead with his spade ace and led a diamond to dummy's king and East's ace. East shifted to the heart jack and South took a finesse, losing to West's king. After the heart return cleared the heart suit, South crossed to dummy's spade jack and led the diamond 10 from dummy. East unflinchingly played low and South went wrong. He played for the drop and when West discarded, South could win only eight tricks.

When East followed suit to the second diamond, the odds slightly favored playing for the drop, offered South. "West held one more unknown card than East; therefore, he was a 13-12 favorite to hold the diamond jack."

South's argument did have validity, but that's not where the mistake was made. Since South needed only three diamond tricks and not four, he should win the first spade in dummy and take a deep diamond finesse against East. Had the finesse lost to West's jack, little would have been lost. The important point is that West would not have been in position to attack in hearts. South would then have had ample time to develop at least nine winners.

South's play of today's diamond suit fueled much controversy. South claimed he went with the odds in playing for a drop. North argued South should have finessed. Both overlooked South's actual mistake. Follow the play to see if you can spot when and where South went wrong.

South took the opening lead with his spade ace and led a diamond to dummy's king and East's ace. East shifted to the heart jack and South took a finesse, losing to West's king. After the heart return cleared the heart suit, South crossed to dummy's spade jack and led the diamond 10 from dummy. East unflinchingly played low and South went wrong. He played for the drop and when West discarded, South could win only eight tricks.

When East followed suit to the second diamond, the odds slightly favored playing for the drop, offered South. "West held one more unknown card than East; therefore, he was a 13-12 favorite to hold the diamond jack."

South's argument did have validity, but that's not where the mistake was made. Since South needed only three diamond tricks and not four, he should win the first spade in dummy and take a deep diamond finesse against East. Had the finesse lost to West's jack, little would have been lost. The important point is that West would not have been in position to attack in hearts. South would then have had ample time to develop at least nine winners.

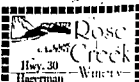
Shemar, echoed his partner's take on the long practice sessions and recalled the day he first met with the producers. "I walked around the circus and came upon the cage with the lions and tigers snarling at me and I knew there was no way I would do the lion tamer bit," he said. "The high wire was appealing, of course, and they asked me to stand on it. I had on heavy combat boots and sweats, so I was clumsy, to say the least, but I got the gig. Then the hard work began. I also had to fight a fear of heights. When they moved us from 10 feet to 20 feet, that's when I knew I had to conquer

my fear once and for all. As Leon would say, 'You have a respect of heights,' and that gave me a whole new outlook."

When the actual taping was set for the show, the couple, dressed in dazzling, shimmering costumes and looking sensational, performed their act with the grace and skill of professionals. Both Schae and Shemar admit there was a bit of a letdown after the taping. They miss the nightly training periods and even went through a period of withdrawal. But most of all they miss the constant challenge.

Shemar is already thinking about next year and may take a whack at the swing pole act. Mario Lopez, of "Saved by the Bell" fame, conquered the swing pole this year, and like Shemar and Schae took to the circus like a seasoned pro.

Most kids dream at one time or another of running away and joining the circus. Shemar Moore and Schae Harrison got to live that fantasy, even if it was just for a few months.

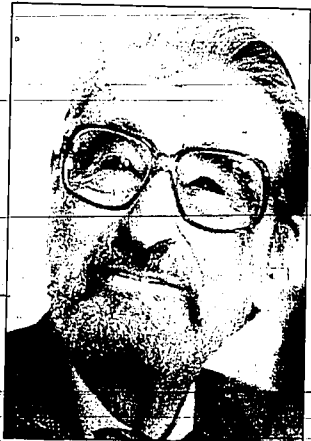

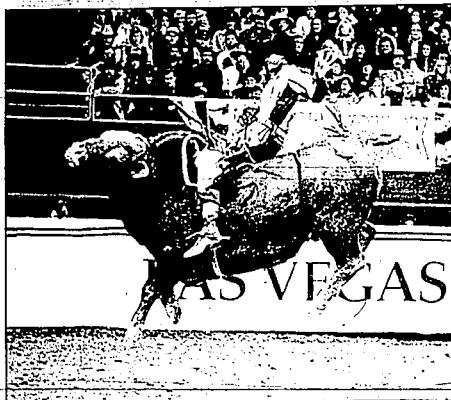

TV takes aim at reaching more Hispanic viewers

LOS ANGELES (AP) — It's not just a merry Christmas for There Goes the Neighborhood Productions. It's much better, it's also felt Navidad.

The young, Hispanic-run company was picked by a Disney division to produce a TV music special and album with such top talent as Plácido Domingo, Jose Feliciano and Celia Cruz.

But "Navidad en las Américas" (airing 10 p.m. ET Wednesday and repeating Dec. 25 on the Univision network) is more than just another holiday program.

As the first original Spanish-language effort from Disney's Buena Vista Productions International, "Navidad" is a milestone for Hispanic Americans long ignored as television creators and consumers.

And the trio that formed Neighborhood Productions — Michael Dagnery, Dan Guerrero and Lisa Orozco Rosales — as well as other Hispanics rising in the Hollywood ranks say it is part of an ongoing, overdue change.

Studios and TV networks are beginning to reach out to Latino producers to tap the generally ignored Hispanic market, here and abroad, with English- and Spanish-language programs.

The growth in TV channels, profitability of so-called "niche" programming, an improved overseas market and a new wave of Hispanic executives and producers are cited among the reasons.

"What's happening now we all saw 10 years ago," said Guerrero. "It's just taking a lot longer than we thought."

Those intent on adding a Hispanic voice to U.S. network television are starting in near silence.

A decade-long study from the University of Pennsylvania found that Hispanic characters consistently account for about 1 percent of prime time TV roles.

Hispanic actor Jimmy Smits, "NYPD Blue's" new star, is a rarity.

This in a nation where the Hispanic population is

9 percent and nearly dominant in cities such as Miami (about 50 percent) and the entertainment industry's home base, Los Angeles (42 percent).

Nely Galán, an independent producer who has affiliated with Fox to create Latino programming, says the gap between TV and reality leaves young Hispanics — and advertisers trying to woo them — out in the cold.

"The big issue, in terms of all of us hustling and trying to sell this market, is plain as day: We grew up in this country, we're major consumers, and there is

no way you can reach us," she says.

The Spanish-language networks, Galán said, tend to attract older audiences.

The younger 18-35 group watches such network fare as "Beverly Hills, 90210."

"There's a big, ugly conspiracy against us," Galán maintains. "It's simply economics; if networks could make money with programming for mainstream white audiences, why change?"

And, she and others point out, there were few with authority enough to demand change.

"Right now in Holly-

wood, I would probably say you could name Latino executives on one hand who are in positions of power in television," said Lijiah Villalobos, director of Buena Vista International.

Villalobos is among those Latinos beginning to crack the power structure, part of the reason that at least a boomlet in Hispanic-oriented programming may be on the horizon.

"As a Latino executive, I realize the reason why more Latino projects are not coming to pass is that nobody was pitching ideas," she said. "I took it upon myself to go to (Dis-

ney's) theatrical department, the television department, the animation department and Walt Disney Records."

That gave rise to the album "Navidad en las Américas," the TV special and English- and Spanish-language documentaries on the making of the project. The TV show has already been sold to 18 countries, Villalobos said.

The potential of the vast Spanish-language market worldwide is helping drive new interest in Hispanic programming, say Villalobos and others. Stabilization in Latin American

countries and in their currency are making them more attractive.

In the United States, broadcasters and cable operators have seen that money can be made targeting smaller niche groups. Fox, for example, has scored with programs like "Living Single," geared to black audiences.

As awareness of the 26 million U.S. Hispanics and their estimated \$190 billion purchasing power grows, that could translate to more work for those producers who know the Hispanic culture and how best to reach it on TV.

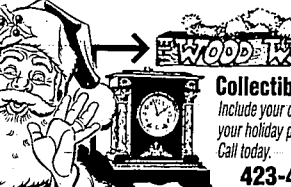

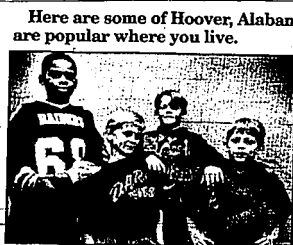

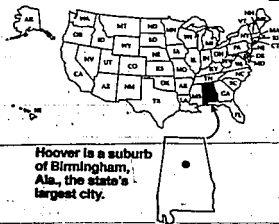

Rookie Cookie's Recipe
