# U.S. pilot walks across Korea line to freedom

PANMUNJOM, Korea — U.S. Army helicopter pilot Bobby Hall, looking weary but OK, walked to freedom today.

His walk ended a 13-day crisis that threatened to plunge relations between the United States and communist North Korea back to Cold War levels.

The South Korean Defense Ministry in Seoul said Hall crossed the border in the truce village of Panmunjom at 11:16 a.m. (7:16 p.m. Thursday MST). The Pentagon confirmed the release.

Hall, captured after his helicopter went down in North Korea Dec. 17, was released after the Clinton administration publicly expressed regret for the incident — but did not admit to spying as the North had charged.

Hall's co-pilot was killed in the downing.

Hall's family in Brookville, Fla., cheered when they got word he had been released. Tears streamed down the face of his wife, Donna, and mother, Diane.

President Clinton had personally called

U.S. military hospital in Seoul for a medical checkup and debriefing, the radio said. Harvey Perritt, a Pentagon spokesman, said Hall could be back in Florida as early as this afternoon.

U.S. and North Korean officials agreed to a written understanding saying the helicopter "accidentally strayed into North Korea." State Department spokesman Michael McCurry said in Washington on Thursday.

As its part of the deal, McCurry said,

Hall, 28, looked a bit tired as he crossed the border but seemed to be in good health, with no visible injuries, according to South Korea's MBC radio.

He was flown by helicopter to the U.S. military hospital in Seoul for a medical checkup and debriefing, the radio said.

"The United States expresses sincere regret for this incident" and will work to prevent similar occurrences.

North Korea said it decided to return Hall "with magnanimity and humanitarianism" after he "admitted his crime of illegally intruding into" North Korean airspace, according to its official news agency. The North released a handwritten apology it attributed to Hall on Thursday.

The breakthrough ended days of delicate negotiations in which U.S. officials tried not to antagonize the North Koreans nor sound too conciliatory.

Clinton this week dispatched State Department diplomat Thomas Hubbard to work for Hall's release amid concerns that the incident would jeopardize a fragile agreement over North Korea's nuclear program.

# President will go for 2nd term

WASHINGTON — Putting to rest speculation that he might not seek a second term, President Clinton declared emphatically Thursday he would run for re-election.

"He professed not to care whether he is challenged from within the Democratic Party or faces a third-party candidate in 1996, saying, 'I'm not worried about it.'"

"I intend to seek re-election but that is not uppermost in my mind," Clinton said in a year-end interview with wire service reporters. He said his chief motivations were to better the lives of citizens and improve the operation of government.

Clinton was asked if there were any circumstance under which he would not seek a new term. "No," he answered quickly. "As long as I have my health and I'm doing a good job."

Clinton's intention to seek re-election comes as little surprise. He has indicated since the Democratic debacle in the November mid-term elections that despite the obstacles he faces in trying to govern with Congress firmly in Republican hands, he has no intention of walking away from the White House.

He is putting together a new political team that will include many of those who engineered his 1992 victory, but with some new faces. He has been described as furious at those aides whose bad advice contributed to the GOP landslide and determined to serve as his own campaign manager in his re-election bid.

Clinton's tone was upbeat despite the difficult political road ahead and continuing turmoil within his administration. A day earlier, Central Intelligence Agency director R. James Woolsey surprised the White House by announcing his retirement, adding to the long list of vacancies that Clinton must fill as he enters the second half of his term.

The president said that he anticipates conflict with Republicans on budget and tax matters, social issues like gun control and appointments to administration jobs. But he expressed hope that the White House and the GOP-led Congress could reach accommodation on such issues as welfare reform, restructuring the government and the line-item veto.

"There will be divisions, there will be differences, there will be hard fights. There ought to be, there will be, I can assure you there will be," Clinton said.

"But there will be a lot of things we can do together... if we really try to help the country instead of to help ourselves in the next election," he said.

He said his top priority would be enactment of his middle-class tax cuts, a \$50 billion package of tax cuts for families, education incentives and tax breaks for retirement accounts.

# Farms to sprout warning signs

TWIN FALLS — Starting New Year's Day, federal regulations will require farmers to post roadside signs along fields where pesticides have been sprayed.

Further, farmers will be obligated to provide training, protective clothing, and basic decontamination equipment for family members and employees who are exposed to pesticides, said Dave Fullmer, president of the Twin Falls County Farm Bureau.

The new Worker Protection Standard Act, as it's known, falls under the authority of the federal Environmental Protection Agency. The new requirement is a good idea, Fullmer said, but it means more work for farmers — and could cast farming in a bad light.

"Next year, you will be required by law to help the EPA tell the general public that you are poisoning the environment," local Farm Bureau directors warned members in a letter earlier this month.

"These posters are really bad (public relations) for agriculture," Fullmer said Thursday. "They might send the wrong message to the general public, that we're out poisoning the land."

"We're not doing anything different than what we've done before," he said. To blunt the threat of bad publicity, the Twin Falls County Farm Bureau lobbied

the EPA's regional officials to add a few words to the warning signs: "Responsible Pest Management Area."

It took four months to convince the EPA to agree to the additional message, Fullmer said. Signs with the new message have been distributed to about a third of the farmers in Twin Falls County, he said.

The signs will also state when pesticide-treated fields can be safely entered. In addition to signs, farmers will have to provide basic decontamination equipment such as clean water, towels, and eye wash. Beyond that, farmers should consider equipping their workers with specialized clothing.

"A farmer who wants to feel comfortable

with this report, I understand that," said Alan K. Campbell, chairman of the Commission on the Social Security "Notch" issue.

But Campbell said Congress acted in 1977 to ensure the stability of the Social Security system and had not singled out "notch babies" when reducing benefits.

Congress made the cutback that year because a flaw in the benefit formula adopted in a 1972 law was causing the initial benefits received by each year's crop of new retirees to be far higher than intended, threatening to bankrupt Social Security.

"The 'notch' issue is caught up in the broader debate over the future fiscal health of the Social Security trust funds and the more narrow economic conditions of the

1970s, when the nation's inflation rate outstripped wage growth.

In describing the "notch," the commission's report offered an example of two workers who retired at the same age with average career earnings. One was born on Dec. 31, 1916 and the other on Jan. 2, 1917. If both retired in 1982 at age 65, the difference in benefits was \$110 a month.

For persons born from 1917 to 1921, initial benefits on average decreased with each year, reaching the bottom of a V-shaped notch in 1920-21. Benefits gradually increased in the following years, leveling off by 1926, charts in the report show.

The commission "notes that the perception of uneven treatment between those in

the "notch" years and those just before them was magnified by the decision of Congress to fully grandfather under the old law individuals born prior to 1917.

Congress could have and in retrospect probably should have limited the growth in the benefits received by pre-"notch" individuals.

"That group... about 5.3 million retirees born from 1910 to 1916 whose benefits are still governed by the old formula... has received an increasingly generous return on its investment in Social Security," Campbell said.

The commission considered reducing the increase in pre-"notch" benefits, but decided it would not be appropriate to cut payments to persons 78 and older.







# Fleet cutbacks bring gory days for today's bombers

Prime time is over for U.S. symbol of strength

**BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. (AP)** — The glory days for strategic bombers are over.

Once the most powerful symbol of America's superpower strength, the bomber fleet has been cut so dramatically that one might call this its gory days. The number of bombers with global reach has dwindled to about 190, or one-tenth the number that were flying in the darkest days of the Cold War.

Much of what's left is not fully ready for conventional combat. Some of the bombers have been moved from active-duty units to the reserves.

The hulking B-52 bombers based at Barksdale, a converted cotton field along the Red River, have plenty of fight left in them. But hardly anyone would have predicted even five years ago that an aircraft designed in the late 1940s would approach the 21st century as the mainstay of the bomber fleet.

For now, the B-52 is the only U.S. bomber fully ready for both nuclear and conventional war.

"There's nothing that can do it like this airplane," says Capt. Kelly Lawson, 29, of Brandenburg, Ky., a B-52 navigator in the 96th "Red Devil" Bomb Squadron here.

The Cold War is over, of course. The threat of global nuclear war is all but gone, and bombers aren't necessary for today's air-launched weapons of choice.

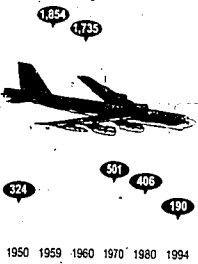
The F-117A stealth fighter, for example, played the main strategic bombing role in the 1991 Persian Gulf War, while B-52s mostly dropped "dumb," or unguided, bombs on Iraqi armored forces and other tactical targets.

The Air Force says bombers are vital to U.S. national security. Others disagree.

"They're an anachronism," Peter Boyes, a retired Air Force colonel who flew B-17 bombers in World War II, said in an interview. Boyes says the bombers' survival is a classic example of the military reluctance to let go of the past.

"The Army kept horse cavalry until 1944," he said.

Even if billions more dollars are spent, as now planned, to fix shortcomings on the two newer-generation bombers — the B-1B Lancer and the B-2 Stealth — the U.S. fleet will be operating far below its potential for years.

With the dissolution of the Soviet Union — the main bomber target — the Air Force was left with a mismatch of arms and airplanes; too many of its bombs and missiles are too inaccurate for the planes' new missions.

"The bomber force will be relatively ineffective until at least the year 2000 no matter how large it is," Rand Corp. concluded last May in an Air Force-sponsored study. Rand said the Air Force has been slow to field a better mix of weapons.

Bombers have held a special place in the military's war-fighting plans. Unlike the Air Force's huge ballistic missiles that can launch from underground silos and streak across the globe in a matter of minutes, manned bombers can be recalled

once deployed, and they can strike without going nuclear.

Even the threat of a U.S. bomber strike can be an effective psychological weapon.

In the Clinton administration's post-Cold War calculus, the bombers have prevailed over the ICBMs. Their real "competition" now are Navy aircraft carriers, and the tensions are hardly hidden in the public comments of service leaders.

Adm. Leighton W. Smith Jr., commander of U.S. and NATO forces in southern Europe, offered this put-down recently:

"I'm on the front lines, and anybody who thinks a B-2 ... can do the kind of things an aircraft carrier could, doesn't understand the real world."

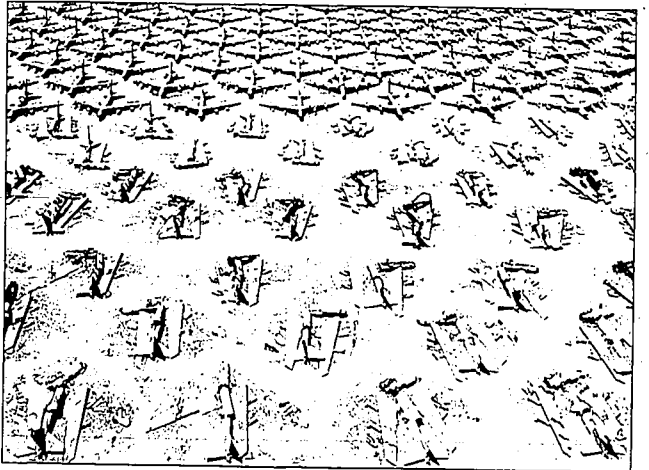
The real world of today isn't what it was in the bombers' heyday. Until September 1991, U.S. bombers stood on 24-hour alert, ready to head for the Soviet homeland on a moment's notice. But the demise of Soviet communism eliminated the need for such hair-trigger readiness; it also changed the rationale for spending tens of billions of dollars on new bombers.

Hundreds of B-52s, in fact, have been retired to an aircraft "honeyard," waiting to be cut up for parts, at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base at Tucson, Ariz.

The B-2 was essential, the Air Force argued during the plane's development by Northrop Corp. in the 1980s, to keep up with modernized Soviet air defenses. But the modernization never happened, and the B-2 lost its stated mission.

Instead of making 132 of the radar-evading planes as planned, the goal was cut first to 75, then, ever so reluctantly, to 20. So far, four B-2s have been delivered to the Air Force. None is ready for combat. Even after they are rolled out, the first 18 B-2s will undergo major modifications to bring them up to snuff. All told, the B-2 price tag will be about \$2 billion per plane.

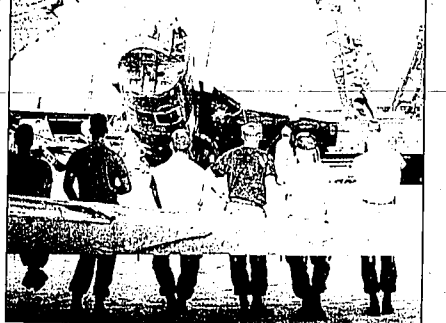
The B-1, which originally was built as a nuclear-only bomber, is

being converted to a strictly conventional role — at a cost of billions of dollars. The original fleet of 100 B-1s cost \$20 billion. None has ever been used in combat. There now are 95 B-1s, although only 72 are immediately available for combat use.

# B-52 is still workhorse of bombers, still ready for nuclear war

**ABOARD FLIGHT "DOOM 98"**

At 370 mph, just 400 feet above the Kansas prairie, Capt. Mitch Hansen steers his run-in, roaring B-52 bomber to its target.

On the windless lower deck, bombardier Capt. Andre Mouton held his radar aim and Capt. Joe Hagans, navigator, counted down to a carefully calculated launch point.

"A single bomb plummeted to earth, 'destroying' a mock anti-aircraft artillery site. Hansen thrust a glow stick into the air to signal a successful strike, then pulled the huge plane into a steep climb and banked left.

This was a practice nuclear strike (with a dummy warhead, of course) — a mission the Air Force considers important enough to keep on the training schedule for B-52 crews, even though the threat of nuclear war today is the lowest in many decades.

The B-52, which entered the Air Force fleet four decades ago, is surprisingly versatile. Besides nuclear bombs, it is capable of launching cruise missiles, Harpoon anti-ship missiles, nuclear gravity bombs and sea mines.

B-52s dropped one-third of the tonnage of U.S. bombs used against Iraq in the 1991 Gulf War. The plane gained lasting fame in Vietnam as an aerial terror.

The B-52's main liability is its extraordinary bulk. It's a fat target for enemy guns. The plane weighs as much as 488,000 pounds and is wider than it is long (wing span of 185 feet, compared to length of 160 feet). The control flaps on its wings cover more space than the entire

wings of most fighter planes.

That's why the crews practice flying and fighting below the reach of radar. For all its strengths, the Boeing-built B-52 is getting old and sometimes shows its age.

The mission named "Doom 98" that flew out of Barksdale Air Force Base, La., on a steamy September morning was late because of an inter-com problem and then a more serious generator fault cropped up. The fixes were made, though, and the crew calmly adjusted its flight plan on the run.

The mission was hardly in the category of aerial attacks that Pentagon leaders say are most likely to be called for in the post-Cold War era. In fact, there never has been a nuclear attack against a tactical target like an anti-aircraft artillery emplacement, and it's hard to imagine one by the United States in anything except a nightmare scenario: all-out, global nuclear war.

Yet the Air Force wants it known that B-52s at Barksdale and Minot Air Force Base, N.D., can still do these doomsday missions in addition to conventional strikes.

Hansen and the other crew from Barksdale's 96th "Red Devil" Bomb Squadron said they spend roughly 20 percent of their training time on nuclear missions. That's a lot less than in the past, but it keeps them proficient.

For now, in fact, the 94 B-52s in the Air Force fleet are the only long-range bombers fully equipped to fight both a nuclear and a non-nuclear war.

"I like to think the B-52 is the proven workhorse," said Brig. Gen. David Young, who flew B-52s in Vietnam and now is

commander of Barksdale's 2nd Bomb Wing. The plane is a relic, but one the Air Force counts on heavily as the mainstay of a strategic bomber force that has shrunk drastically over the past 30 years.

The Air Force says the B-52s could last until the year 2030. And they may have to: there is not a new long-range bomber even on the drawing board. The only bomber still in production is the B-2, and current plans call for the last of 20 B-2 Stealth planes to be delivered to the Air Force in 1998.

With some sprucing up, the "Bull" (short for Big Ugly Fat Fellow), as the B-52 is affectionately nicknamed, has repeatedly defied predictions of its demise. The B-52s have been rewired, reamed and stuffed with some of the latest electronic gadgetry, including low-light TV sensors to improve their low-level performance. They also have an updated electronic jamming system.

Gen. Curtis LeMay, who commanded the nation's bomber fleet at the height of the Cold War, called the B-52 "obsolete" and "on the way out." That was in 1968. Yet it flies on.

To an observer of a B-52 training mission, the idea of dropping nuclear bombs at a height of 400 feet seems suicidal, even if the cramped cockpit has lead-lined curtains to shield the crew from a thermonuclear flash.

But Capt. Kelly Lawson, a B-52 instructor-navigator at Barksdale, says such low-level nuclear strikes would

be standard. The B-52 is hardened to withstand blast effects. Parachutes slow the bombs' descent, giving the plane more time to escape.

On this mission to the Smokey Hill bombing range near Salina, Kan., the "Lucky 13" B-52, tail number 60-0013, made eight passes over its target, six times dropping a single bomb and twice conducting a computer-simulated bomb launch.

The bombs that "Lucky 13" dropped were BDU-38s, which are mock ver-

sions of the B61 nuclear bomb. The B61's yield is variable; it could be set as high as 300 kilotons, or about 20 times the explosive power of the bomb dropped on Hiroshima in 1945.

## High winds cancel balloon-launch

**RENO, Nev. (AP)** — Breezy weather scrubbed a fifth attempt by the crew of the Earthwinds Hilton balloon to make a nonstop flight around the world.

## HHS: GOP plan would abandon 5 million kids

WASHINGTON (AP) — Countless single mothers and their children could be pushed out of their homes under a Republican plan to revamp the welfare system by denying aid to teen-agers, Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala said Thursday.

Shalala, in the Clinton administration's harshest attack on the GOP welfare overhaul, said the plan would cut off cash benefits to 5 million children while providing only a fraction of the money needed to care for them in orphanages or foster homes.

States would have to drain their own treasuries to finance orphanages for these children, expand an already overcrowded foster care system, or "hope and pray" that private charities and other relatives would meet the demand, Shalala said.

"And if they can't, we can expect to see countless young mothers and their children relegated to poverty, quite possibly on the streets — homeless and without any hope for the future," Shalala said. "The solution to the welfare crisis is not to send children to orphanages; it's to send their parents to work."

The Republican bill seeks to discourage illegitimacy by ending cash and housing benefits to single teenage mothers and their children. It includes a five-year limit on cash benefits and withholds aid to children until paternity is legally established.

States could use the savings to promote adoptions and establish orphanages for children whose families could no longer afford to support them.

But an analysis by the Department of Health and Human Services suggests that only \$293 million would be returned to the states for orphanages or foster homes.

That is only enough money to finance 8,029 places in orphanages, or 61,053 placements in group homes, HHS said, while at least half of the 10 million children now receiving Aid to Families with Dependent Children would be dropped from the rolls.

Shalala said the 1938 movie "Boys Town" touted by incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., as an instructive portrayal of orphanages — must be contrasted with the

"reality of orphanages and state budgets."

"The real issue here is not whether orphanages or group homes can be loving and compassionate facilities," Shalala said. "The issue is what actually happens to millions of real-life children who would be cut from welfare rolls, with no far Flanagan (Boys Town's founder) in sight and no money to pay for the real costs of child-rearing."

According to the Child Welfare League of America, residential care costs an average of \$100 a day, or \$36,500 a year. Foster care costs about \$400 a month, or \$4,800 a year.

The average monthly benefit for a family of three on AFDC was \$373 in 1993, a figure that does not count other aid to the poor such as subsidized housing, food stamps, or Medicaid.

House leaders have promised a vote on their welfare bill, known as the Personal Responsibility Act, by early spring.

Although the Clinton administration has begun trying to discredit the legislation, the White House has yet to reveal its own strategy for welfare reform in 1995. A senior administration aide, however, said those decisions hinge on the outcome of a bipartisan summit meeting in January with the president, governors and lawmakers to find common ground on the issue.

Last week, an Agriculture Department analysis found that the Republican plan would drop 6 million low-income Americans from the food stamp rolls in 1996 and cut spending on federal nutrition programs by more than \$30 billion through the year 2000.

## U.S.: Flight wasn't spy mission

WASHINGTON (AP) — Accused by North Korea of spying, the reply from Washington boils down to this: Sure we spy — but not with unarmed helicopters flown by newcomers at 100 feet.

One pilot with flying experience along the demilitarized zone puts it this way: "We don't put people at risk when we have machines that can do the job for us."

An examination of the record and interviews with U.S. military officials suggest that "Razorback 19," the Army helicopter flight into North Korea that left one pilot dead and a second in North Korean hands, went awry as a result of bad luck, inexperience and a lack of technology to back up what turned out to be faulty human reckoning.

According to U.S. officials, the flight was one of dozens that might take place daily near the demilitarized zone.

One pilot is said to have been training the other how to fly in the highly restricted air space near the border — and to stay south of a buffer zone that ranges from four to 10 miles below the border and is intended to prevent just this kind of incident.

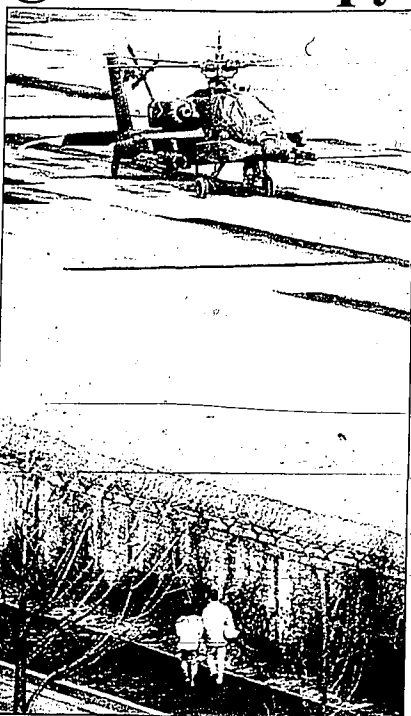
The Army routinely flies over the region near the demilitarized zone to train in case of war, deliver supplies to ground troops and look for evidence of any North Korean incursions into the South. Pilots are particularly on the lookout for evidence of tunnels.

A pilot who has flown Army helicopters along the DMZ said it was absurd to think U.S. military commanders would rely on an unarmed helicopter to gather intelligence over the North when the military has unmanned drones, high-flying spy planes, camera-equipped satellites and sophisticated eavesdropping equipment that can do the job better and more safely.

"We work hard to keep people out of harm's way in this business," said the pilot, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Chief Warrant Officer Bobby Hall remained in captivity Thursday, nearly two weeks after the Dec. 17 incident in which his helicopter went down over North Korea. The body of his partner, Chief Warrant Officer David Hilemon, was buried Wednesday.

A statement released by North Korea purporting to be Hall's "confession" said the fliers deviated from their planned route in a

"criminal action."

Though officials say the flight over North Korea was inadvertent, there's no doubt the U.S. does spy on North Korea. Indeed, the Pentagon relied on electronic intelligence sources to first pinpoint the time of the downing.

And earlier this year, when tension with North Korea over nuclear weapons was high, Pentagon officials were able to describe in detail

how many tanks and soldiers the North Koreans had clustered near the border.

In the current case, there are reasons the North Koreans might be suspicious.

The helicopter was shot down more than 10 miles northwest of a checkpoint beyond which it should not have flown. A senior military official described the landmark as easy to see.

Also, the OH-58A helicopter was part of a newly arrived battalion of Apache attack helicopters. One job of the OH-58A, as the North Koreans have said, is to precede the Apache into battle as a target spotter.

The weather was clear, with visibility of six miles.

These flights are surprisingly low-tech ventures, with pilots looking at maps on their laps and trying to spot landmarks below.

"You're more concerned about avoiding the mountain peaks around you, and trying to use a map while avoiding them is a full-time job," said Retired Maj. Gen. John K. Singlaub, chief of staff of the United Nations force in South Korea during the 1970s.

Both Hall and Hilemon had arrived in Korea on Nov. 4 as part of the Apache helicopter battalion. Though an experienced pilot, Hall had flown only 10.7 hours in the restricted flight zone, called "P518." It was Hilemon's first flight in the restricted zone.

Because it is considered hardship duty, soldiers shuttle in and out of Korea for one-year tours, forcing the Army to constantly train new arrivals on life near a hostile border.

A number of other factors could well have contributed to the incident:

• The helicopter had no global positioning system equipment that could have told the pilots exactly where they were.

• Radar controllers could have issued a "hot dog alert" warning to the helicopter had they seen it near the border, but hilly terrain and the low altitude blocked the aircraft to drop off radar screens.

• Border sentries had no radio link with the helicopter, and it passed overhead too quickly for them to get to their box of warning flares.

• AWACS radar planes usually patrol near the border and might have flagged down the helicopter, but they weren't flying that day.

All this has generated repercussions within the military. The Apache battalion attached to the 17th Aviation Brigade, Hall's unit, is barred from flying in the restricted zone pending a review. All pilots in Korea are getting refresher training. And warning procedures for flights near the DMZ are being reviewed.

It's not being treated as a spying issue — at least in Washington.

## U.S. population exceeds 261 million

WASHINGTON — The U.S. population has climbed to 261.7 million, the Census Bureau reported Thursday.

The annual year-end estimate shows growth of 2.5 million people in 1994 for a total of 261,653,497.

The growth includes a natural increase of 1.7 million — 4 million births minus 2.3 million deaths — plus 733,000 in immigration and the return to the United States of 84,000 Americans, including armed forces, from abroad.

## Race problems persist in military

WASHINGTON — Despite the military's generally good record on race relations, overt cases of racism and subtle forms of discrimination still pervade some military facilities, the House Armed Services Committee said Thursday.

The findings of a one-year bipartisan study of racial discrimination "comprise a complex web of good news and bad news," said the report issued by outgoing committee chairman Rep. Ronald Dellums, D-Calif.

The good news is that many service members rated the military's equal opportunity climate as positive.

On the negative side, overt forms of racism such as racial slurs and jokes were common at four of the 19 U.S.-based and overseas facilities surveyed.

## Group: Coors Co. has drinking problem

WASHINGTON — A consumer group wants the nation's largest brewery to cancel a program that allows its employees to drink two beers just before leaving work each day.

The Coors Brewing Co. calls the program a privilege that the few workers who partake are responsible enough to handle. But the Center for Science in the Public Interest said it puts impaired drivers on the road each afternoon.

"No other major brewer allows on-site drinking," said CSPI's George Hacker. "They allow workers to take home a six-pack or two six-packs for home use, they don't pump them out before they go out to their cars."

Coors once provided its 5,100 employees with unlimited beer during lunch hours and breaks. The only workers not eligible were those who operated plant machinery, and they could drink at the end of the work day.

## Lawyer: Bomb suspect denies charges

NEW YORK — In his first "lucid" discussion with his lawyer, Edward Leary denied involvement in a subway firebombing and said he would be willing to take a lie detector test, the attorney said Thursday.

In a five-minute conversation before he was wheeled to an operating room Wednesday, Leary denied that he had carried the bomb or even a glass jar on the train, which the fire erupted Dec. 21, said Leary's lawyer, Stephen Murphy. He also denied plotting extortion or writing extortion notes.

"I told him, 'Please don't have me go down there and say this if you didn't do it. He said he didn't do it,' said Murphy.

Eight people were hurt when a homemade firebomb went off on the Lower Manhattan subway.

## Treatment may starve cancer of blood supply

BOSTON (AP) — A new treatment still in the test-tube stage appears to make cancers wither and stop spreading by choking off their blood supply, researchers say.

The developers of the treatment say it may overcome shortcomings that have doomed earlier attempts to starve cancers.

The drug is still in early stages of development and has not been tested on people. Many potential cancer treatments look promising at such early stages but fail when tried on the sick.

A report on the new work, conducted at the Scripps Research Institute in San Diego, was published in Friday's issue of the journal Cell.

The treatment uses an antibody called LM609. When injected into the blood, it seems to stop newly forming blood vessels from receiving signals they need to keep growing. Sending out new blood vessels is an essential step in

the growth and spread of tumors.

"The antibody tricks these newly forming vessels into self-destruction, or programmed cell death, by interfering with their survival signal," said Dr. David A. Cheresh. "When the signal is blocked, the cells think they are in the wrong place and commit suicide."

Cheresh and Peter C. Brooks, the treatment's developers, said animal studies suggest it will work against cancers of the lung, breast, pancreas, brain, larynx and skin.

The researchers have tested the treatment on tumor fragments placed in chicken embryos. They said they hope to begin studies on people within 18 months.

Earlier attempts to starve tumors have failed because cancer can use more than one method to grow blood vessels. Experts hope the new approach interferes with a process that is essential to all these methods of growth.

## Theme park workers blamed for explosion

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — A fire works explosion at Universal Studios Florida that threw sheets of metal across a nearby neighborhood was caused by employee mistakes, officials said today.

No one was injured in the Tuesday afternoon blast, but "people got the scare of their lives," said John Mezzanella of the state Fire Marshal's Office.

The blast occurred when park employees were disposing of unusable fireworks, and packed too much explosive material into a metal container set in an undeveloped area, fire and park officials said.

## Activists blast Micron aid plans

**TWIN FALLS** — Two anti-tax activists and a state lawmaker are declaring war on tax-increment financing — the program Twin Falls is using to lure Micron Technology Inc. to the Magic Valley.

One-time gubernatorial candidate Ron Rankin says the program amounts to "corporate welfare for developers." He's vowing to fight any effort by Kootenai County to give similar breaks to Micron.

And in Boise, the Legislature could bar cities from extending tax-increment financing to corporations — or at least limit the programs.

The Association of Idaho Cities told its members last week that the incentive program could come under attack during the 1995 session. Sen.-elect Rod Beck, R-Boise, said Thursday he's looking at modifying the program.

Currently, 12 Idaho cities, including Twin Falls and Jerome, offer the programs or are creating tax-increment plans.

Tax-increment financing allows cities to create urban-renewal agencies that provide money to help businesses. The money is repaid from the new business' property taxes.

The city of Twin Falls has offered to pay for farmland and other amenities at a site near the Hansen Bridge for a Micron factory, explaining it would recoup the money through tax-increment financing.

Twin Falls Economic Development Director Dave McAlindin says the programs are legitimate — and a boon for business. "It is not a tax giveaway, it's not a tax break, it's not a tax abatement," McAlindin said.

Twin Falls has used the incentives three times recently to lure businesses to the Magic Valley — or encourage local businesses to expand. "We don't offer that to everybody," McAlindin said. "We offer that to companies we think are a good

match for Twin Falls. They're used sparingly and judiciously."

But Rankin said such packages should require voter approval before they become binding on a city.

"Those who pay should have a say," Rankin said.

Rankin's proposal will be on the ballot in Post Falls on Feb. 7, and he's also pledging to fight Micron in Rathdrum, another Kootenai County community.

The Magic Valley and Kootenai County are two of 13 areas on Micron's short list for a new \$1.3 billion semiconductor plant that would employ 3,500 people.

While Rankin is leading the fight in the Panhandle, Sen.-elect Beck and former Republican congressional candidate Rachel Gilbert are blasting tax-increment financing in Ada County.

Beck says he supported tax-increment financing legislation in 1987, but says the program was only intended to address urban-renewal projects in blighted areas.

"The incremental financing was never designed to do the kind of economic development that is now being considered with Twin Falls and Nampa," Beck said. Using the program to lure businesses "diminishes the tax base," he added.

Gilbert says Micron's Twin Falls County package — worth several million dollars — will shift the burden tax for schools, law enforcement, and fire control from the corporation to other property owners.

"You can't tell me Micron needs to have taxes skimmed off. I think once people understand it, they'll know it's a terrible scam," Gilbert said.

She calls the tax breaks "an absolute cancer that's going to gut our state when it comes to our revenues."

## City leaders put company on agenda

**TWIN FALLS** — With the Twin Falls area getting serious consideration for a \$1.3 billion factory expansion by Micron Technology Inc., city leaders still have to figure out if the company could fit into the city's growth plan.

In a special meeting at 8 a.m. today, the City Council will begin talking about how Micron would affect the city and its infrastructure.

Two sites in the Jerome-Twin Falls area are on Micron's short list for expansion.

One site near the Hansen Bridge would be provided with Twin Falls city water and sewer hook-ups. The other site, at the junction of Interstate 84 and U.S. 93, also would affect Twin Falls — even though that is in Jerome County.

Twin Falls City Manager Tom Courtney told the council that the city needs to determine "if the location of the Micron facility is a good fit from a quality of life standpoint."

To do that, Courtney said the city must understand how Micron would affect the following aspects of city life:

- Job creation and growth of other businesses.
- Population growth.
- Revenue increases from property taxes and market values.
- Transportation needs.
- Water and sewer services.
- Parks and recreation opportunities.
- Crime and fire services.
- School systems.
- Outlying county infrastructure.

Courtney said he thinks the city should hire a consultant — probably from JUB Engineers — to assist city officials in completing this impact study before the end of January. Work on such a plan would start Jan. 3, 1995, and be completed by Jan. 25, he said.

"Based on the results of this study and your sense of public opinion, you will need to make a decision to either continue or withdraw the city's proposal," Courtney advised the council. "Keep in mind, the city's proposal only applies to the Hansen Bridge site."

Courtney also said the council would need to reach conclusions on the effect of Micron before the company chooses an expansion site in February.

The council will meet at City Hall. A closed-door session will follow the hearing on Micron.

There already may be enough snow to fill Island Park and American Falls reservoirs if spring runoff precedes fast irrigation demands, said Mike Beus of the Bureau of Reclamation.

On Tuesday, Island Park was 54 percent of capacity and American Falls was 42 percent full.

But considerably more snow is needed to refill Jackson Lake in western Wyoming and Palisades and Ririe reservoirs in eastern Idaho.

The long-range forecast does not bode well. The National Weather Service predicts slightly below average precipitation and lower than average temperatures through February.

# Park rangers kill 5 bison outside Yellowstone

BOZEMAN, Mont. (AP) — Game wardens assisted by Yellowstone National Park rangers killed five bull bison Thursday near Gardiner, just outside the park boundary, the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks said.

Attempts to send the bison into the park by hazing them didn't work, said Cheryl Matthews, a Yellowstone information officer. She said another 18 bison were lingering near the park border at Gardiner and it was possible that on

Friday rangers would try hazing to get them into the park.

Earlier this week, wardens killed two other bison in the same area.

All seven carcasses will be auctioned in Bozeman on Friday, said Bernie Kuntz, a spokesman for the state wildlife agency.

Montana's interim bison management plan calls for bison to be killed if they leave the park, enter private land and landowners complain.

If bison leave the park but stay on public land, do not approach cattle

and do not cause problems, they are allowed to live, according to the policy. About 200 bison are outside the park near West Yellowstone.

The five bulls left the park for a number of reasons, including fear of the disease brucellosis, and property damage caused by bison, church officials consistently have requested wandering bison be killed.

Hundreds of bison have been shot on church property over the past several years.

# Filer City Council updated on county's comprehensive plan

FILER — County Commissioner Bruce Reinke was on familiar ground as he spoke to the City Council recently on the progress of the update on the county's comprehensive plan.

Reinke was a member of the Filer City Council before accepting his seat on the County Board of Commissioners this year.

The comprehensive plan covers population, economic development, housing, land use, public services, schools and facilities, transportation, community design, special sites, natural resources, hazardous areas and recreation, Reinke said.

He stressed the need for council members to comment on the proposed changes to the comprehensive plan as soon as possible.

In other council business:

- Council member Wanda Shaffer recommended that the city apply for the Gem Community Program.
- "We should pursue this program as hard as we can. It's in our best

interest to become a Gem Community," she said.

- Brit Groom presented the proposed plans for the second phase of the Golden Spur Subdivision. City attorney Eric Wonderlich said that several items in the developers' agreement need clarification: The agreement calls for water lines to 8 inches, except for those lines serving only cul-de-sacs, which can be 6 inches. The agreement says that a cash deposit, certified check, negotiable bond or an irrevocable bank letter of credit must equal the cost to build the specific public improvements, as estimated by the developer's engineer and approved by the City Engineer.
- The council voted to authorize the mayor to execute the final draft of the developer's agreement contingent upon the Council reviewing the maps.
- Neil Harpster, David Riedesel and Michael Shipa proposed a development north of Filer. They want to develop a "five star manufactured home estate" on 17.8 acres owned by Jim DeVries.

Riedesel said they propose 60 to 80 "upper class modular housing units."

The group feels that this development would be a credit to Filer.

Wonderlich told the developers their first step would be to request an amendment to the zoning ordinance to permit mobile home parks in the R-1 zone. Their second step would be to apply for a special-use permit.

- Streamline the system and improve communications between agencies.

After the package passes, "somebody's going to be in control of that. It isn't going to be the kid if he violates the law," Darrington said.

The system, Darrington says will be "faster and smoother, and we hope that the punishment will be swift and sure."

"We want kids to fear the juvenile justice system, we want there to be consequences. That's our whole goal," Darrington added.

Celia Gould served on the juvenile-justice committee with Darrington this summer. She says reform will be at the forefront of the new legislative session.

She predicts the committee's proposals will pass, and sees up to \$2 million being spent on these changes. Gould says juvenile justice will have "a balance between rehabilitation and punishment that is consistent from the local level on up."

And the terminology will change, too. Violent offenders won't have "house workers" anymore — they'll have probation officers.

In prior years, the Health and Welfare-run juvenile justice system focused more on protecting the offender than society, critics charge. "There was more of an attitude that we didn't want to stigmatize the kids; give them a rap at such an early age but with the severity of the crimes, that attitude has changed. People want to know who the juvenile offenders are in their area," Gould added.

During the 1994 gubernatorial campaign, Gov.-elect Phil Batt said the Department of Corrections should handle juvenile justice. But Batt has indicated he'd be willing to back an independent department — as long as Health and Welfare isn't handling juvenile justice.

Rep.-elect Wendy Jaquet, D-Republic, also expects to see juvenile justice legislation in Boise. But she said legislators must consider the ramifications of the proposal, and see who ends up paying for the reforms.

Said Jaquet: "Some of the costs appear to be mandated costs to the counties."

Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, wants to see the legislation implemented. "I hope we can pass the package pretty much intact. The biggest message I got is that the

whole system needed to be changed."

McRoberts, another juvenile-justice committee member, said that since juvenile crime is a community problem, "we have to develop programs at the community level and preventative programs."

## Rupert strives to improve image

RUPERT — The city has an image problem. A drive around Rupert's square will reveal a handful of vacant buildings, which have led some people to think the city may be dying.

But that image is not accurate. Mayor Dwinelle Allred said. He has appointed a business development committee that is charged with increasing the number and quality of Rupert businesses, he said.

Allred said he appointed the committee of business owners headed by Councilman Steve Barras, because he saw a need.

"I felt that the business climate did not seem to have the energy it needed," Allred said.

He wants the committee to identify businesses to draw to Rupert.

"We're looking for businesses that will keep people shopping in our community," Allred said.

It is premature to talk about incentives the city can offer to attract businesses, he said.

Committee member Russ Holland, Rupert's manager and 1995 president of the Organization of Rupert Businesses, said he's asked the city to consider an incentive package that might include a year's break in utilities or reduced hook-up rates.

Among business owners, Rupert is known for its high electric rates. ACE Hardware manager Quinn Montague said a few years ago he could have hired another part-time employee with the difference in electric costs between the Rupert and Burley store.

"We pay more for less," Montague said, although he noted that now rates seem to have improved.

Holland said he would like to see businesses like a woman's clothing

store, a department store and a linen store come into town.

"We're looking at independents. We feel like they can be friendlier and provide better service, something we pride ourselves on," Holland said.

Holland said Rupert definitely has "down-sized," but there's still a lot of business to be done.

"Small towns are always the ones that suffer when regional shopping malls come in," he said, noting that town square traffic has decreased since Wal-Mart and Kmart have come to Mini-Cassia in the past three years.

"For a long time, there was an attitude of protectionism in small towns. They were doing so well they didn't want people to come in. That mentality has done a 180," Holland said.

Minidoka County Commissioner John Rensberg, a farmer, said change in America's farms also has contributed to the decline of independent businesses.

"The day of 40 acre farms is gone," he said.

In 20 years, he said, predictions are that a farm will need to be at least 3,000 acres to be economically viable.

Farms find better deals when they make supply bids at large operations, Rensberg explained.

"The me and pop store can't compete," he said.

Rensberg said Rupert needs to take a good look at itself.

"It needs to make an analysis of its problems and begin to take an in-depth look at all of its aspects, past, current and the future if nothing is done," he said.

Stan Buckley, owner of Finish Line, said he put up all his savings to open up his lube service and car wash in Rupert more than four years ago.

"Rupert is a good place to do business, because people in Rupert like services just like anyone. Too many people overlook it. We get a lot of business," Buckley said.

## Andrus OKs voter registration requirement

BOISE (AP) — In one of his final official acts in 14 years as chief executive, retiring Gov. Cecil Andrus has signed an executive order requiring voter registration services at all state agencies having regular contact with the public.

The order, effective on Sunday, calls on state agencies to coordinate registration services with the Secretary of State Pete Cenarrusa, the state's chief election officer, and the county clerks, who control elections in their jurisdictions.

"Voting is a fundamental right and responsibility, and voter registration should be encouraged by governmental entities at all levels," Andrus said in announcing the order on Thursday. He leaves office on Tuesday.

The order comes on the heels of the state's first experience with Election Day instant registration that produced an additional 31,000 voters for last Nov. 8's record nonpresidential election turnout.

Lawmakers adopted instant registration to head off being forced to implement the federal government's

so-called Motor-Voter law that requires voter registration to be offered when drivers apply for licenses or when people apply for public assistance like welfare and food stamps.

But while the details of the Andrus executive order were not provided, it appeared to essentially implement many of the provisions of the Motor-Voter law.

Idaho's voter registration is currently estimated at over 75 percent of the more than 800,000 eligible voters. Turnout in November was 67 percent of those registered.

## Hospital head quits

RUPERT — Minidoka Memorial Hospital administrator Randy Holom confirmed Thursday that he has resigned.

Holom, who turned in a letter of resignation last week, declined to comment on why he resigned.

Holom, who has been with the hospital for five years, said he will stay at Minidoka for the next six months. In the meantime, he plans to do some job hunting at other hospitals, he said.

## Kmart clothing set ablaze again

SPOKANE (AP) — For the second time in a month, someone has set fire to clothes in a Kmart store here.

An arsonist ignited two racks of clothes, about 30 feet apart, in the men's department Tuesday, said Ernie Nye, an investigator for the Spokane Fire Department.

"One didn't cause much of a fire because it (the merchandise) was polyester. It just melted," Nye said Wednesday. "The other was cotton and it burned."

Several hundred dollars' worth of clothes were ruined, mostly sweat suits.

Nye said the arsonist probably used a cigarette lighter.

A Dec. 10 fire at the store was similar, he said.

No one was hurt in either incident. In both cases, the fires were put out without having to force customers to leave the store on the city's east side.

McOmber has led the Utah Symphony for more than a year after executive director Paul R. Chummers resigned in July 1993.

Earlier this year, the symphony board approved the hiring of Nan Harman of the Rochester Philharmonic, but she subsequently declined the offer.

The Utah Symphony, which has operated under a projected deficit of \$259,000, considered disbanding this year but decided to proceed with the orchestra's 1994-95 season. Symphony officials plan to reassess the situation again next year.

Andrews is expected to assume his Utah Symphony duties by March 1.

Diverse crowd seen as

PAUL A Mini-Cassia fine arts center would need to draw a diverse population to be a success, Minidoka County Commissioner John Rensberg said.

"You would have to be able to drive a tractor onto the stage," Rensberg said, noting that the area's major benefactors would be more in support of a facility that would involve everyone.

Rensberg and two members of a 15-member Mt. Harrison Heritage Foundation turned out for a 7 a.m. planning meeting Thursday. Foundation treasurer Shirley Poylsen blamed the low turnout on the holidays.

Minidoka commissioners agreed at their regular meeting last week to support the project by sending a representative to its meetings and offering the county's legal counsel.

The foundation wants to build a center that would include an art gallery, a convention center and a concert hall across

from Conner's Gate on Highway 27.

The county and foundation need to agree on a land sale, Rensberg said.

Foundation President Clarence Bellem said the foundation has enough money to pay the county three years' worth of about \$4,000 payments on the land. Bellem hopes a recreational vehicle dealer will invest in the site to help it pay for it.

Poylsen said the foundation has received much public approval and some donations for the long-term project, already in the works for five years, and that booking at the Burley High School auditorium is tight.

"We feel there needs to be another building available for that purpose," she said.

Poylsen said that it will be easier to sell the idea to the public when the foundation has something more substantial to present.

"We're trying to sell something abstract right now, and it's very difficult," she said.

# Grozny bombed as Chechen leader seeks peace

GROZNY, Russia (AP) — As one of the most furious air assaults of the war roared above his underground bunker, Chechnya's rebel president said Thursday he was ready for peace but showed no signs of backing down.

The Russian army battered villages and Grozny, the capital, with bombs and artillery shells and engaged in fierce clashes on the edges of Grozny.

Ground forces poised near the city limits reportedly entrenched their positions. Defense Minister Pavel Grachev dismissed speculation of an all-out storming of Grozny, but declared his forces would "advance deep into the town with a view to confiscating weapons and eradicating gangs."

Holed up in a bomb shelter underneath the presidential palace while Russian bombers roared overhead, Chechen President Dzhokhar Dudayev sent a telegram to Russian leaders saying he was still ready to talk peace.

But despite the worsening odds faced by outmanned Chechen forces, there was no evidence Dudayev was thinking of compromise. He has refused to negotiate unless Russian troops withdraw from Chechnya.

The Russians claimed to have shot down Dudayev's personal helicopter and one aerial bomb just missed the presidential palace, devastating a nearby house.

Air strikes pounded the already-devastated city and artillery thudded on the fringes throughout the day.

Thick clouds of smoke rose from the industrial district as Russian bombers pounded it for a third straight day. One bomb destroyed part of a refinery and another barely missed a factory's liquid ammonia tank in what the Chechens said would have been a catastrophe.

"It is just impossible to get out of here," an unidentified Chechen spokesman told the Interfax news agency from Dudayev's bunker, apparently referring to the ravaged city itself. Tens of thousands of residents already have fled the capital, which formerly had a population of 400,000. Those remaining have had their water supplies and power cut off, and some could be seen cooking outdoors.

The Chechens say hundreds of civilians have died, most in air raids in Grozny, since up to 40,000 Russian troops entered the Caucasus Mountains region on Dec. 11. The Russians have intensified their attacks in recent days.

"We simply cannot keep track of how many buildings are destroyed, how many people are dead," said Aslanbek Dudayev of the official Chechen news agency.

A flashpoint of Thursday's action was the town of Argun, nine miles east of Grozny.

Russian jets, firing flares as deterrents against heat-seeking missiles, dropped hundreds of tons of explosives on the town. Artillery positions on the outskirts of Argun then began a barrage which lasted for much of the day.

Soon, the center of Argun lay in ruins, many buildings burning out of control and sending up clouds of smoke which could be seen for miles.

Chechnya's government claimed forces shot down three Russian planes Thursday. The Russians denied it.

The Chechens said Russian forces advancing from the west were digging trenches at their positions three to six miles from the city center. The column engaged in a bloody battle at the strategic village Khankala the day before.

Dudayev, who broke off talks with Moscow on Dec. 14, sent a telegram to Russian leaders saying he wants to resume them. But he did not make clear whether he would not approve talks without a Russian pullout.

The text of the telegram, according to Interfax: "Reaffirm readiness to personally head talks with the Russian side at the level of (Prime Minister Viktor) Chernomyrdin. Government delegations have been prepared to conduct talks at any other level. Ready to start negotiations."

Moscow did not immediately respond.

### Serb leader delays signing Bosnia truce

PALE, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Bosnian Serbs indicated Thursday they will sign a four-month truce with the government, suggesting that intense U.N. diplomacy to save a crumbling cease-fire had produced results.

Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic first said he might sign the agreement Thursday. But after four hours of talks with top Bosnian Serb officials, the U.N. commander in Bosnia said more negotiations lay ahead.

"There is good will on both sides, and I hope we're going to get some conclusion by the weekend," Lt. Gen. Sir Michael Rose told reporters in Pale, the Serb stronghold east of Sarajevo. "Today might be a little soon, because we were not expecting it before Dec. 31 or Jan. 1. We still have two days to go."

Karadzic left the talks midway to attend another meeting. No other Bosnian Serb leader had any comment.

### Bangladeshi premier agrees to resign

DHAKA, Bangladesh — Her government paralyzed by a 10-month walkout of opposition legislators, Prime Minister Khaleda Zia caved in Thursday to their demand that she quit before the scheduled 1996 election.

In return, Mrs. Zia asked opposition lawmakers to work with her to get government back on track. Most of them resigned from parliament on Wednesday.

The prime minister publicly agreed to step down one month before the balloting. She had made the conditional offer to them in closed-door talks Wednesday, but her opponents refused her demand to end anti-government protests and went ahead with the mass resignations.

The political crisis has stymied efforts at improving conditions in one of the world's poorest and most-crowded countries.

### Turkish Airlines jet crashes, killing 53

ANKARA, Turkey — A Turkish Airlines jet with 76 people aboard crashed into a mountain in eastern Turkey in heavy snow Thursday, killing 53 people, officials said.

The plane was carrying 69 passengers and seven crew members. Transportation Minister Mehmet Kostepe said. Most of the passengers were military personnel and the passenger list did not show any foreigners aboard.

The Boeing 737 took off from the capital, Ankara, and crashed about five miles from its destination, the city of Van. The plane was making its third attempt to land after two previous tries were aborted because of harsh weather, Anatolia reported.

### China passes nation's 1st prison law

BEIJING — In an attempt to rein in rising crime, China's top legislative body passed the country's first prison law Thursday.

The law was intended to ensure that criminals receive proper penalties, the official Xinhua News Agency reported. But the report said it also guaranteed prisoners' rights to safety and appeals.

Although China does not publish nationwide statistics, regional figures and anecdotal evidence suggest crime is increasing. Top leaders held a meeting last week urging better security and crime-prevention measures.

The legislation passed by the National People's Congress requires prisoners to work as part of their rehabilitation. Xinhua said in a brief summary of the 78-article law.

### Kashmir sinking kills 11 Indian soldiers

NEW DELHI, India — Eleven paramilitary soldiers drowned when their boat sank in Kashmir province in northern India, a news agency reported Thursday.

The soldiers were on a patrol in the Jhelum River near the border with Pakistan when the boat capsized Wednesday, Press Trust of India reported, quoting an official government spokesman.

It was not immediately clear how the boat sank or if it was attacked by guerrillas. Muslim rebels have been fighting for more than four years for the independence of Jammu-Kashmir, the only Muslim majority state in predominantly Hindu India. Nearly 10,000 people have been killed.

### Double-decker buses crash in London

LONDON — Two double-decker buses crashed Thursday, trapping several passengers and sending 14 people to a hospital.

No one was believed to have been seriously hurt, however, and most passengers were walked away from the collision near Trafalgar Square, authorities said.

Some of the passengers were taken by helicopter to a nearby hospital as firefighters worked to free several people trapped in the buses.

Authorities said the crash occurred when one bus ran into the back of the other, but they had no further explanation of what went wrong.

## Chechnya can become Yeltsin's Waterloo

MOSCOW — The war in Chechnya will haunt Boris Yeltsin.

It has already damaged the Russian president's popularity and credibility and it threatens what is left of his political future.

Old fears about Yeltsin's unpredictability, his grip on power, and his health have surfaced as he lurches from one tactic to another and seems unable to achieve his goal of crushing Chechnya's dream of independence.

Politicians, analysts and ordinary Russians are divided about the impact of the grisly destruction of Grozny and mounting casualties.

Some say Yeltsin is finished this time. Others say it's too early to write him off, and predict he'll come roaring back — as he has so many times in his long, rocky career domestically.

What is increasingly clear is that Yeltsin turns to force in a crisis.

Twice within 14 months, Yeltsin has used tanks and troops to settle a political conflict: in October 1993 against the Russian parliament in Moscow and now in Chechnya.

Wolfgang Leonhard, one of Europe's foremost Russia experts, told Germany's ARD television Thursday that the invasion of Chechnya is political suicide. He said it is pushing Russia closer to a nationalistic-authoritarian regime.

He predicted Yeltsin would lose if presidential elections were held tomorrow.

More and more Russians think Yeltsin is no longer running the country. They believe a cabal of men in

uniforms from the army, police and secret service are in charge.

"We don't know who rules the country," the daily Segodnya wrote Thursday.

Yeltsin's authoritarian streak was evident early in his career, when he was Communist Party boss in Yakutsk. He tolerated no opposition.

After he came to Moscow in 1986, Yeltsin became a prominent reformer. People were willing to overlook his rough treatment of his opponents.

Even after the October 1993 violence, he still had the support of reformers and many citizens.

These two pillars of his power have crumbled in past days, casualties of the relentless attack on Chechnya with its mounting death toll, his brutal use of the army, his lies and contradictions.

Russians welcomed Yeltsin's announcement Tuesday that he had ordered an end to the bombing of Grozny, the Chechen capital. They were stunned a day later when the airstrikes resumed, destroying an orphanage.

His broken promise, coupled with the government's crude propaganda about the Chechen war, have crippled Yeltsin's credibility.

It may be that Yeltsin dreads the fate that befell his nemesis — former Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev. Gorbachev's indecisiveness cost him his job and ultimately led to the breakup of the Soviet Union.

The attack on Chechnya, which declared independence from Russia in 1991, may be Yeltsin's way of saying he will keep the Russian Federation together at any cost.

But the cost may be more than he bargained for. As the crisis drags on, the number of people who want him to pay — personally — is sure to grow.

## Thais breed feud over tiger parts

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — A proposal to legalize the breeding of tigers so they can be slaughtered for Chinese medicine has sparked a bitter feud between animal breeders and wildlife experts over the fate of the vanishing cat.

With less than 5,000 wild tigers left in the world, breeders are pushing the Thai Forestry Commission to allow them to raise tigers so they will have unlimited bones to grind and organs to dry to make Chinese medicine.

The poisons are widely used among ethnic Chinese in Thailand and around the world in the belief that they cure everything from arthritis to impotence. There is no scientific evidence supporting that belief.

Although there is a U.N. ban on the international trade of tigers, Thailand has the right to sell the Asian cats — and their parts — domestically.

Somphong Tensiraphong, director of the Siracha Farm, is betting the government will approve the proposal. He is raising 35 tigers in Bangkok and notes that a dead tiger currently fetches up to \$10,000 on the black market.

"We intend to breed as many tigers as possible," Somphong says. "I hope the government will find some way for us to turn the mature and dead bones into commercial products."

He has a display case filled with Chinese medicine, including the dried sex organs of a male tiger. They sell illegally for about \$4,500, but he insists they are not on the market. Somphong is hoping he can soon sell them legally.

Other breeders are preparing for that likelihood by separating cubs from their mothers so they can provide a second litter within six months.

"These people are just doing it for money with no thought for Thailand's reputation or conservation," said Leonie Vejjajiva of the Thailand Wildlife Foundation. "What they want is to end up selling tiger steaks ... for aphrodisiac purposes and I just don't think animals should be used like this."

# Andrus' days in office are numbered — just ask him

BOISE (AP) — The movers have come for Gov. Cecil Andrus.

Or at least for a life-size painting of him, and almost everything else in his office.

"They stripped this morning," Idaho's retiring governor said Wednesday at the door to an office containing a mostly bare desk.

A few family photos still sat on a table behind the desk, and a few books remained on a shelf.

A few state-owned paintings remained. But most of the wall decor — including the life-size likeness in the lobby — was moved out by the afternoon.

So were awards, artifacts and other personal mementos Andrus has collected over the years.

Andrus officially hands his office on the second floor of the Statehouse to Republican Gov.-elect Phil Batt on Monday. He was counting down.

"It's two and a half working days," Andrus said. "I just don't need a disaster over the weekend."

By Tuesday, Andrus' belongings will be set up in a new office at Boise State University. Offices on the fifth floor of the Education Building will house the Andrus Center for Public Policy, a private, non-profit organization.

The center, still in preliminary stages, will sponsor research, conferences and forums on issues

important to Andrus — including natural resources, education, health care policy and economic development. Andrus will receive no pay from the center.

Eventually the university will house all the official papers from his 14 years as governor and four years as Interior secretary.

There is little left on Andrus' agenda and no planned public appearances before stepping down, spokesman Scott Peyron said.

While Batt does not take the oath of office until Monday, he is free to move in over the weekend, Peyron said. By midday Monday, Andrus will officially hand over the office keys and the ignition key for the blue Cadillac with the license plate "1."

The office staff has been preparing for the goodbye for weeks, so the mood remained upbeat. "There's too much to do to sit and whine," Peyron said.

## Fish and Game commissioner predicts orderly change in Batt administration

LEWISTON (AP) — Idaho Fish and Game Commission Vice Chairman Keith Carlson says Republican Gov.-elect Phil Batt does not plan sweeping changes in the six-member panel.

Batt at times was critical of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game during the campaign. And after last month's victory there was speculation that he would overhaul the agency and the commission that oversees it.

But during a meeting earlier this month with Carlson and Fish and Game Commission Chairman Richard Hansen of Bayview, Batt focused mostly on quieting the wilder speculation.

"He said he didn't intend to have

### Attorneys believe racist fliers broke law

IDAHO FALLS — Federal attorneys have shifted gears and say racist fliers placed on cars outside an Idaho Falls National Association for the Advancement of Colored People meeting likely broke the law.

George Breitman, director of the U.S. attorney's office told a special city meeting he believed the state's malicious harassment code applied, but a conviction is never guaranteed.

Breitman met Wednesday with a mayor's committee on cultural awareness. Also there were Robert Lamb of the U.S. Department of Justice, Marilyn Shuler of the Idaho Human Rights Commission and Mike Dillon of the FBI.

"This was certainly racial harassment," Breitman said. "It is muddy, taking into account their intent, but we'll do our best to prosecute."

### INEL proposes career placement center

IDAHO FALLS — The U.S. Department of Energy is softening the impact of laying off 1,250 workers with a proposed Idaho Falls career placement center and an economic development grant.

Energy last month announced the impending Idaho National Engineering Laboratory layoffs. A work force restructuring plan is also up for public review.

The career center would help those displaced, and then guide career guidance for workers in the future.

"I don't know that it would ever go away," said Lucille Bennett, Energy-Idaho's industrial relations specialist.

To decrease the economic effects on the region, the department is considering giving a \$325,000 economic planning grant to the Eastern Idaho Economic Development Council. It would help identify new private-sector uses for INEL facilities.

### Ada considers lasers for smog checks

BOISE — By 1996, smog checks in Ada County may be performed by a laser device that reads tailpipe pollution as vehicles roll down the street.

Denise Turner, executive director of the Ada County Air Quality Board, said it would be cheaper — as low as \$4 a year per car instead of the average \$11 now — and more convenient than emissions inspections now required.

The \$4 probably would be paid with registration. And there is a bonus: Turner said many violations would be detected months before the annual checkups for carbon monoxide, prompting motorists to voluntarily get their cars adjusted sooner.

The county will run a four-week test beginning next April to determine whether the new method will work. If it does, Ada County will become the first place in the country to go to laser checks, she said.

## Lottery game will cut prizes this weekend

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Lottery wasn't kidding when it said the new BANKO Doubler lotto game was a good deal.

In fact, it was designed to pay out more than it took in.

That might sound like a strange way to run a lottery, but Director Wally Hedrick said it makes sense. By early December, the state had amassed \$1.4 million in unclaimed lottery winnings, including a \$100,000 Powerball ticket purchased in Kimberly. By state law, the money must go back to players.

By offering exceptional odds, lottery officials figured they could promote the new BANKO Doubler game and pay back some of the money to players.

But today is the last day to take advantage of the good odds on the game that replaced Idaho Fantasy Five earlier this month. Starting Saturday the payouts will decrease for some prize categories.

"None of the players knew it would be operating like this. We just said it had the best odds of any lotto game in the country," Hedrick said.

The change had announced the new BANKO Doubler game. It was a surprise to many players, who were taking in, reportedly, could have been overwhelming and the hard could have been exhausted, Hedrick said.

It's too soon to tell how much the game took in and paid out. Those figures will be available Saturday.

### Ada plan would help prosecutions

BOISE (AP) — Ada County law enforcement officers, prosecutors and victims' advocates have developed a new strategy aimed at improved handling of domestic violence cases.

Ada County Deputy Prosecutor Joe Filicetti said the plan was based on the way domestic violence is prosecuted in San Diego. The key is investigators and prosecutors approaching cases as though the victims will not testify.

Filicetti said authorities will conduct more thorough investigations to begin with so prosecutors can put together better cases and bring more to court.

"Hopefully, we're going to empower victims to take the stand," Filicetti said.

Police and sheriff deputies in Ada County will carry a one-page domestic violence report forms for listing injuries, where the incident occurred, medical attention and other factors. The forms are designed to help officers pay more attention to details.

TWIN FALLS — Brien Godfrey, a 31-year-old banker from Spokane, Wash., was "having breakfast in a coffee shop in Bliss one frigid January morning in 1990 when he came across the oddest thing in the newspaper.

It was a photograph of a bunch of fools water-skiing on the ice-frenzied Snake River near Shoshone Falls. On New Year's Day.

"I thought, 'I gotta find out more about this.' Godfrey was in the Magic Valley to interview for a job with First Security Bank. He got the position, but he couldn't find the skiers — not until the day after Christmas that year.

"I finally got an entry blank for Freeze on Skis (the Magic Valley Jaycees' annual New Year's Day water-skiing fund-raiser for charity), and I decided just for fun to see how many pledges I could raise," he said. "It turned out I was the second one on the water."

In seven years, Freeze on Skis has collected about \$35,000 for various charities, including \$6,500 last Jan. 1. Under the rules, skiers and knee-boarders gather sponsors, and sponsors may off if the skiers show up and ski.

"I kind of like it because not many people expect bankers to go in for this sort of thing," said Godfrey, now 35 and a commercial loan officer for First Security.

Despite the season, the weather has been brutal only twice in Freeze's tenure — in 1991, when bitter cold forced the postponement of the event from Jan. 1 to Jan. 13, and in 1993, the snowiest winter in a half-century.

"I haven't had any trouble out on the water, and I haven't fallen yet," Godfrey said. "I hope I never do, because the water's cold. Typically less than 40 degrees on New Year's Day, the Snake River is chilly enough to freeze an unprotected bather in less than two minutes.

"I just wear a bathing suit and a wet suit," Godfrey said. "It keeps you just as dry in the winter as it does in the summer."

Many skiers look forward to a plunge into the hot-tub that sits by the riverside, but not Godfrey.

"The hot water makes your feet feel like they've swollen up to five times their original size," he said. "And then you don't want to get out."

## Country legend Wynette rings in '95 in Jackpot

JACKPOT — Tammy Wynette earned her title: First Lady of Country Music.

Born Wynette Pugh in 1942, in Itawamba County, Miss., she was raised picking her grandparents' cotton. She got married, the first time, a month before her high school graduation.

Divorced in 1965, she supported three daughters by singing on early-morning TV in Birmingham, Ala., and working as a beautician. The family lived in a housing project.

In 1966, the young mother moved to Nashville and auditioned for Billy Sherrill at Epic Records. He changed her name, and her life.

Since then, there have been three more divorces, another daughter (from her marriage to country music superstar George Jones) and lots of hit records.

Wynette sang "I Don't Wanna Play House," "D-I-V-O-R-C-E," "He Loves Me All the Way" and "Take Me to Your World," among many others.

She won two Grammys, 16 song-writing honors and three Country Music Association awards. Her life story produced a hit autobiography and TV movie, "Stand By Your Man," named after her signature

song. By 1989, she had racked up 39 Top 10 hits, 20 number one singles and 11 number one albums.

It didn't stop there. Wynette kicked off the '90s by starring in a music video, "Let's Call it a Day Today," directed by her old friend Bud Reynolds. Country music superstars like her "Heroes and Friends" album, launching a series of vocal collaborations that reached its peak with Wynette's own "Without Walls" collection. It features eight duets, with Elton John, Wynonna, Sting, Aaron Neville,

Lyle Lovett, Smokey Robinson, Cliff Richard and Joe Diffie.

In June 1991, Merle Haggard presented Wynette with the TNN/Music City News Living Legend Award. Her music video with pals Dolly Parton and Loretta Lynn is a remake of "Silver Threads & Golden Needles." Her 1992 hit, "Justified & Ancient," was recorded with the synth-pop band, The KLF.

"I did it because it was something different and because I really like those guys. Besides, my twin granddaughters loved to dance around to 'Mu-Mu Land.' They said, 'Meemaw, Meemaw, sing Mu-Mu Land!' And it's all they wanted to hear. And now I have 18 number

one records on that. Can you believe it? I did a TV show with The KLF, and they dressed up as 12-foot ice cream cones."

But the fun and games ended, for a while. Earlier this year, Wynette fought a recurring bile duct infection which poisoned her system and kept her in a Nashville hospital close to death for almost a week.

She told the press, "I've heard people talking about having out-of-body experiences. I didn't have that, but I do know that I was just that far from death. I remember seeing all my girls standing at the foot of my bed with tears in their eyes and thinking, 'That is a pretty picture.' I had no pain. I wasn't scared. It was all just very peaceful. I felt like I was floating somewhere. Maybe this is God's way of telling me that death ain't no big deal."

Wynette pulled through, making a miraculous recovery. After more than 30 years as a smoker, she quit.

Now she's looking toward the future. She's been married to producer/songwriter/longtime friend George Richey since 1978. She's resumed a busier-than-ever schedule of touring and guest appearances. And she's been hosting a weekly TV series, "Legends," on The Nashville Network.

And 1995 is coming.

4. Toby Keith, "Boontown" (Polydor) — A snapshot of an artist maturing nicely as a songwriter and vocalist.

5. Kathy Mattea, "Walking Away a Winner" (Mercury) — Fresh and tuneless and oh-so-touching: Kathy Mattea remains country's class act.

6. Various artists, "Mama's Hungry Eyes — A Tribute to Merle Haggard" (Arista) — Hag's tunes performed with reverence

and spirit. He should be proud of this one.

7. Alan Jackson, "Who I Am" (Arista) — Alan Jackson's relaxed, unassuming charm finally translates to an entire compact disc. And his songwriting is coming along as well.

8. Various artists, "Skynyrd Frynds" (MCA) — Scorching, passionate renditions of classic tunes from the band that brought Southern rock to the country music mainstream.

9. Reba McEntire, "Read My Mind" (MCA) — Reba McEntire uses her commercial cachet to stretch musically, revealing herself as an auspicious work-in-progress.

10. Diamond Rio, "Love a Little Stranger" (Arista) — Album No. 3 reveals what the hype and hoopla about these boys is all about. And after a disastrous second record, this set matches the band's on-stage finesse.

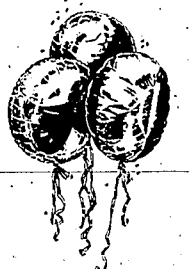

# On his own

Guns N' Roses guitarist won't stray too far from the band while going solo

Guns N' Roses guitarist Gilby Clarke is now former Guns N' Roses guitarist Gilby Clarke. Maybe.

Clarke has decided to play out his solo career as far as it will go. But he doesn't rule out a return as rhythm guitarist to Guns N' Roses, one of the biggest rock bands in the world, home of Slash and Axl Rose.

"This (going solo) is what I'm going to be doing from now on," Clarke says from a tour stop in New Orleans. "I do feel a lot more comfortable doing this. But as far as GN'R goes, well, we'll see."

Clarke's solo record, "Pawn Shop Guitar" (Virgin), pucks a bunch of surprises — especially if you expect more of Guns N' Roses' epic metal.

There's plenty of serious guitar crunch (all the other GN'R members play on one track or another). But there's also country, psychedellic rock and a little R&B, plus a speeded-up cover of the Rolling Stones' "Dead Flowers."

"I made my record just because I wrote a bunch of songs," Clarke says. "I'm not a great

singer by any means. But I think it's important for me to sing my songs; because that makes it personal."

The personal tour extends to the shows. A club tour means crashing in the bus instead of a five-star hotel, swigging a brew instead of sipping champagne. But it also means Clarke can hang out after his show and shoot the bull with his fans.

"In GN'R, you never see anybody except the rest of the band and the people you work with," he says. "But solo you get in touch with real people again."

Plus he gets to play exactly what he likes. Clarke digs all the typical rock touchstones — the Stones, the Beatles, T. Rex, David Bowie — but he also loads the sound system with those cheesy '70 hits you've been trying to forget for 20 years.

"The Night Chicago Died," oh yeah, that one comes up a lot," Clarke says. "The thing is, I know how to play all that stuff. I never sat down and learned it, but you listen to it for so long and you just know."

Clarke shuffled among a slew of rock bands before Guns N' Roses called him in '91 (he

was a friend of the guy he replaced, Izzy Stradlin).

He also paid the bills as a secret fill-in guitarist for bands that, well, couldn't play.

"Certain producers would have these bands, and the guitarist couldn't handle the songs or whatever, and they'd call me in after the bands had gone home," Clarke says. "I'd come in at midnight and play the part and the band would never know about it. I pledged not to tell anybody."

He laughs. "But sometimes a song will come on and I'll say, 'Yeah, I played that.'"

Now, the world's most famous Gilby — his moon refused to use his given name, Gilbert — gets to play his own tunes. Instead of filling stadiums with Guns N' Roses, he sometimes has trouble packing clubs.

"Sometimes it gets a little frustrating," he says. "It's rough out there for rock bands right now, especially in the States. Sometimes we don't get the big crowds. But in other countries ... I just went to Argentina and played, and there were 500 kids outside my hotel room. That was kinda cool."

# Ex-Blondie singer Harry digs for her musical roots

"The song sounds familiar if a bit more urgent. Contemporary."

"Too-toe-toe dancing very close."

As strobes flash and hips mash seductively at the nightclub of the moment, that high female soprano — equal parts crystal and intoxicants — sparks memory synapses.

It's her, you think.

"I was co-na-tose ..."

But why would the disc jockey play her alongside current club confections by Madonna and M People? Clubs are into new music.

Perhaps that last beer was the first of too many.

"Wall to wall/people hyp-notized."

But there's no mistaking that midsonar rap, the one about the man from Mars who ate cars and bars.

"Each night in ra-piature ..."

It's true. Blondie's "Rapture," a 1980 track that helped introduce rap to a mainstream audience, is back. It's sporting a spiffy new mix (you can find it on Blondie's two-CD "Platinum Collection") and it just jumped into the Top 10 on Billboard's Club Play chart.

But former Blondie lead singer Deborah Harry says Blondie's 1983 split is permanent. That's despite a string of four No. 1 singles — "Heart of Glass," "Call Me," "The Tide Is High" and, of course, "Rapture."

"A couple of the guys aren't performing anymore, so I think it would be a bit of a stretch to expect someone to come out of total retirement to take on a job like that. I think what happens with bands is people move on and grow out of it or grow up," Harry, 49, said from the Bahamas, where she was recording vocals for an album by the Argentine band The

Fabulous Cadillacs. "I think drugs probably had a lot to do with changing personalities in the band. Things got a little bit warped."

"You also have to have really good management, somebody who really understands the dynamics of keeping a band together. I think some of those ingredients were problematic for us," Harry said.

Blondie's last album was the bizarre 1982 LP "The Hunter." Harry, born in Miami and raised in New Jersey, has yet to make it big as a solo act, despite strong efforts like 1989's "Def. Dumb & Blonde" CD (any one of that CD's highlights — "Brite Side," "I Want That Man" or "Sweet and Low" should've hit) or "Communism," a track from her most recent release (1993's "Debarvation") and despite influencing many of today's pop women, Madonna in particular.

Harry takes it in stride.

"I worked very hard on those records, and I thought the components were all there. I guess a nice simple way for me to get out of it (is to say) 'Ah, yes, it was lack of promotion,' she laughs. "It's hard to say. I guess I'm not on the A-list. There are different kinds of promotion and artists (that labels) work much harder for. It stings a little when you once were the one they were promoting and then you become the one they are not promoting."

And she's no Madonna, Harry says. "I sort of enjoy the counter-culture kind of position, and she obviously is the commercialization of that vision. She's much more aggressive than I am. Of course I'm envious of her success, fame and beauty. I change my

# Man in Black takes turn at top of rock

Every December it's the same problem: How to squeeze the year's best records into 10 slots when there are at least twice as many worthy candidates. The following list is hardly definitive, but these are the records that made at least one listener's year.

1. Johnny Cash: "American Recordings" (American). In 40 years as one of the central figures in American music (forget categories like "rock" and "country"), Cash has never made an album like this one: alone with his acoustic guitar, ruminating on sin and redemption. Producer Rick Rubin is best known for his work with rock's baddest boys, from the Beastie Boys to Slayer, but "American Recordings" has them all for lunch.

2. Nirvana: "MTV Unplugged in New York" (DGC). Despite the awful title and three covers of Meat Puppets songs (one would have sufficed), this isn't just a rush of past hits like live albums or "Unplugged" performances. It's a revelation, made all the more poignant by the subsequent suicide of singer Kurt Cobain. One of rock's hardest-hitting bands sounds its most passionate with acoustic instruments. Especially stunning are Cobain's readings of the Vaselines' "Jesus Doesn't Want Me for a Sunbeam" and Leadbelly's "Where Did You Sleep Last Night," one of the most lacerating vocal performances in rock history.

3. Luscious Jackson: "Natural Ingredients" (Grand Royal). Few bands combine content and style so effortlessly as this one: The lilting melodies and hip-hop-inflected grooves give the music an optimistic, danceable sway, while the post-feminist lyrics insinuate themselves with conversational charm.

4. Grifters: "Crappin' You Negative" (Shangri-La). Like a lot of underground bands, the Grifters are low-fi explorers who blend melody and noise. Unlike most of them, this band also embraces blues and soul (traditions of their native Memphis) and the music is richer because of it.

5. R.E.M.: "Monster" (Warner Bros.). Beneath the exhilarating walls of guitar feedback, Michael Stipe slips on masks and tries on new voices. The band's soulfulness is still present, but this time it struts like the New York Dolls and snakes like "Idiot" era Iggy Pop.

6. Guided by Voices: "Bee Thousand" (Sart). This Ohio band's terse blasts of pop sound like a secret history of rock, a greatest-hits tour of their influences, from the British Invasion through punk.

7. Red Red Meat: "Jimmywine Majestic" (Sub Pop). Working out an obsession with sex is salvation, as need and lust, and the music of kindness, this Chicago quartet is all about love and interaction. This mood music can rock ferociously, but at its most luminous — in the wordless fade of "Braindead" — it suggests a blurring of the boundaries between bliss and death.

8. Various artists: "1AD (Ambient Dub Volume One)" (Waveform). An expertly programmed compilation of head music, combining the machine-driven ambience of techno with the hypnotic, bass-heavy rhythms of dub reggae.

9. Eleventh Deem Day: "Usa Major" (Atavistic). In a year of unbounded success by Chicago rock bands, here's the best kept secret in town. "Usa Major" is a culmination in which the band crushes its influences and forges the most sophisticated and beautiful music of a nearly decade-old career.

10. Bonnie Raitt: "Longing in Their Hearts" (Capitol). On a midlife roll, Raitt has never made a better album. The tunes are lubricated with laid-back, Southern swing, while Raitt's bluesy voice pours on the honey. Her version of Richard Thompson's "Dimming of the Day" is a classic.

Runners-up: The Jesus Lizard, "Down" (Touch & Go); L7, "Hungry for Stink" (Slash); Sam Phillips, "Martinis and Bikinis" (Virgin); Come, "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" (Matador); Daniel Johnston, "Fun" (Atlantic); Tindersticks, "Tindersticks" (BarNone); Neil Young, "Sleeps With Angels" (Reprise); Boyz II Men, "II" (Motown); Shellie, "Shellie at Action Park" (Touch & Go); Hole, "Live Through This" (DGC).

opinion constantly about her.

# A chilling thought: It's Freeze on Skis

TWIN FALLS — Brian Godfrey, a 31-year-old banker from Spokane, Wash., was having breakfast in a coffee shop in Bliss one frigid January morning in 1990 when he came across the oddest thing in the newspaper.

It was a photograph of a bunch of fools water-skiing on the ice-fringed Snake River near Shoshone Falls. On New Year's Day.

JACKPOT — Tammy Wynette carried her title: First Lady of Country Music.

Born Wynette Pugh in 1942, in Itawamba County, Miss., she was raised picking her grandparents' cotton. She got married, the first time, a month before her high school graduation.

Divorced in 1965, she supported three daughters by singing on early-morning TV in Birmingham, Ala., and working as a beautician. The family lived in a housing project.

In 1966, the young mother moved to Nashville and auditioned for Billy Sherrill at Epic Records. He changed her name, and her life.

Since then, there have been three more divorces, another daughter (from her marriage to country music superstar George Jones) and lots of hit records.

Wynette sang "I Don't Wanna Play House," "D-I-V-O-R-C-E," "He Loves Me All the Way" and "Take Me to Your World," among many others.

She won two Grammys, 16 song-writing honors and three Country Music Association awards. Her life story produced a hit autobiography and TV movie, "Stand By Your Man," named after her signature

song. By 1989, she had racked up 39 Top 10 hits, 20 number one singles and 11 number one albums.

It didn't stop there.

Wynette kicked off the '90s by starring in a music video, "Let's Call it a Day Today," directed by her old friend Burt Reynolds. Country music superstar Randy Travis soon enlisted her for his "Heroes and Friends" album, launching a series of vocal collaborations that reached its peak with Wynette's own "With-out Walls" collection. It features eight duets, with Elton John, Wynonna, Sting, Aaron Neville,

Lyle Lovett, Smokey Robinson, Cliff Richard and Joe Diffie.

In June 1991, Merle Haggard presented Wynette with the TNN/Music City News Living Legend Award.

Her music video with pals Dolly Parton and Loretta Lynn is a remake of "Silver Threads & Golden Needles." Her 1992 hit, "Justified & Ancient," was recorded with the synth-pop band, The KLF.

Of the KLF project she has said, "I did it because it was something different and because I really like those guys. Besides, my twin granddaughters loved to dance around to 'Mu-Mu Land.' They said, 'Meemaw, Meemaw, sing Mu-Mu Land?' And it's all they wanted to hear. And now I have 18 number

one records on that. Can you believe it? I did a TV show with The KLF, and they dressed up as 12-foot ice cream cones."

But the fun and games ended, for a while.

Earlier this year, Wynette fought a recurring bile duct infection which poisoned her system and kept her in a Nashville hospital close to death for almost a week.

She told the press, "I've heard people talking about having out-of-body experiences. I didn't have that, but I do know that I was just that far from dead. I remember seeing all my girls standing at the foot of my bed, with tears in their eyes and thinking, 'That is a pretty picture.' I had no pain, I wasn't scared. It was all just very peaceful. I felt like I was floating somewhere. Maybe this is God's way of telling me that death ain't no big deal."

Wynette pulled through, making a miraculous recovery. After more than 30 years as a smoker, she quit.

Now she's looking toward the future. She's been married to producer/songwriter/longtime friend George Richey since 1978. She's resumed a busier-than-ever schedule of touring and guest appearances. And she's been hosting a weekly TV series, "Legends," on The Nashville Network.

And 1995 is coming.

# Sweethearts, angels, tribute albums top country best 10 records of 1994

Well, the year is almost over, and Billy Ray Cyrus has country music's biggest single with his much-played ditty, "Achy Breaky Heart."

Oops, sorry — it just seems like 1992 all over again. Tim McGraw, 1994's triple-platinum success story, two-stepped his way onto the country scene with a gimmick, just like of 'Cyrus did two years ago.

His somewhat insulting — but, really, just plain stupid — "Indiana Outlaw" assured him a place on radio play lists and a big splash for an ultimately mediocre artist.

So here, then, is the best country of '94:

1. Pam Tillis, "Sweetheart's Dance" (Arista) — In about 30 minutes, Pam Tillis moves seamlessly from spunky seniorita ("Mi Vida Loca") to thoughtful story-

teller ("Calico Plains") and turns in the best album of her career.

2. Patty Loveless, "When Fallen Angels Fly" (Epic) — It seems almost impossible for such a genuinely affecting vocalist to deliver a bad record. And she knows how to pick a good song, too.

3. Hal Ketchum, "Every Little Word" (Curb) — Songs to think about, songs that make you snap your fingers and a voice so pure and honest it's bona fide country music.

4. Toby Keith, "Boomtown" (Polydor) — A snapshot of an artist maturing nicely as a songwriter and vocalist.

5. Kathy Mattea, "Walking Away a Winner" (Mercury) — Fresh and tenuous and oh-so touching: Kathy Mattea remains country's class act.

6. Various artists, "Mama's Hungry Eyes" — A Tribute to Merle Haggard (Arista) — Hag's tunes performed with reverence

and spirit. He should be proud of this one.

7. Alan Jackson, "Who I Am" (Arista) — Alan Jackson's relaxed, unassuming charm finally translates to an entire compact disc. And his songwriting is coming along as well.

8. Various artists, "Skynyrd Frynd" (MCA) — Scorching, passionate renditions of classic tunes from the band that brought Southern rock to the country music mainstream.

9. Reba McEntire, "Read My Mind" (MCA) — Reba McEntire uses her commercial cachet to stretch musically, revealing herself as an auspicious work-in-progress.

10. Diamond Rio, "Love a Little Stronger" (Arista) — Album No. 3 reveals what the hype and hoopla about these boys is all about. And after a disastrous second record, this set matches the band's on-stage finesse.

# On his own

Guns N' Roses guitarist won't stray too far from the band while going solo

Guns N' Roses guitarist Gilby Clarke is now former Guns N' Roses guitarist Gilby Clarke.

Clarke has decided to play out his solo career as far as it will go. But he doesn't rule out a return as rhythm guitarist to Guns N' Roses, one of the biggest rock bands in the world, home of Slash and Axl Rose.

"This (going solo) is what I'm going to be doing from now on," Clarke says, from a tour stop in New Orleans. "I do feel a lot more comfortable doing this. But as far as GN'R goes, well, we'll see."

Clarke's solo record, "Pawn Shop Guitars" (Virgin), packs a bunch of surprises — especially if you expect more of Guns N' Roses' epic metal. There's plenty of serious guitar crunch (all the other GN'R members play on one track or another). But there's also country, psychedelic rock and a little R&B, plus a speeded-up cover of the Rolling Stones' "Dead Flowers."

"I made my record just because I wrote a bunch of songs," Clarke says. "I'm not a great

singer by any means. But I think it's important for me to sing my songs, because that makes it personal."

The personal touch extends to the shows. A club tour means crashing in the bus instead of a five-star hotel, swigging a brew instead of sipping champagne. But it also means Clarke can hang out after his show and shoot the bull with his fans.

"In GN'R, you never see anybody except the rest of the band and the people you work with," he says. "But solo, you get in touch with real people again."

Plus he gets to play exactly what he likes. Clarke digs all the typical rock touchstones — the Stones, the Beatles, T. Rex, David Bowie — but he also loads the sound system with those cheesy '70 hits you've been trying to forget for 20 years. "The Night Chicago Died," oh yeah, that one comes up a lot," Clarke says. "The thing is, I know how to play all that stuff. I never sat down and learned it, but you listen to it for so long and you just know."

Clarke shuffled among a slew of rock bands before Guns N' Roses called him in '91 (the

was a friend of the guy he replaced, Izzy Stralin).

He also paid the bills as a secret fill-in guitarist for bands that, well, couldn't play.

"Certain producers would have these bands, and the guitarist couldn't handle the songs or whatever, and they'd call me in after the bands had gone home," Clarke says. "I'd come in at midnight and play the part, and the band would never know about it. I pledged not to tell anybody."

He laughs. "But sometimes a song will come on and I'll say, 'Yeah, I played that.'"

Now, the world's most famous Gilby — his mom refused to use his given name, Gilbert — gets to play his own tunes. Instead of filling stadiums with Guns N' Roses, he sometimes has trouble packing clubs.

"Sometimes it gets a little frustrating," he says. "It's tough out there for rock bands right now, especially in the States. Sometimes we don't get the big crowds. But in other countries ... I just went to Argentina and played, and there were 500 kids outside my hotel room. That was kinda cool."

# Man in Black takes turn at top of rock

Every December it's the same problem: How to squeeze the year's best records into 10 slots when there are at least twice as many worthy candidates. The following list is hardly definitive, but these are the records that made at least one listener's year.

1. Johnny Cash: "American Recordings" (American). In 40 years as one of the central figures in American music (forget categories like "rock" and "country"), Cash has never made an album like this one: alone with his acoustic guitar, ruminating on sin and redemption. Producer, Rick Rubin is best known for his work with rock's baddest boys, from the Beastie Boys to Slayer, but "American Recordings" is his then all for lunch.

2. Nirvana: "MTV Unplugged in New York" (DGC). Despite the awful title and three covers of Meat Puppets songs (one would have sufficed), this isn't just a rush of past hits like most live albums or "Unplugged" performances. It's a revelation, made all the more poignant by the subsequent suicide of singer Kurt Cobain. One of rock's hardest-hitting bands sounds no less passionate with acoustic instruments. Especially stunning are Cobain's readings of the Vaselines' "Jesus Doesn't Want Me for a Sunbeam" and Leadbelly's "Where Did You Sleep Last Night?"

3. Los Jons Jackson: "Natural Ingredients" (Grand Royal). Few bands combine content and style so effortlessly as this one. The litting melodies and hip-hop-inflected grooves give the music an optimistic, danceable sway, while the post-feminist lyrics insinuate themselves with conversational charm.

4. Grifters: "Crappin'" You "Negative" (Shangri-La). Like a lot of underground bands, the Grifters are low-fi explorers who blend melody and noise. Unlike most of them, the band also embraces blues and soul (traditions of their native Memphis) and the music is richer because of it.

5. R.E.M.: "Monster" (Wamer Bros.). Beneath the exhilarating walls of guitar feedback, Michael Stipe slips on masks and tries on new voices. The band's soulfulness is still present, but this time it struts like the New York Dolls and shakes like "Idiot" on Iggy Pop.

6. Guided by Voices: "Hee Thousand" (Scat). This Ohio band's terse blasts of pop sound like a secret history of rock, a greatest-hits tour of their influences, from the British Invasion through punk.

7. Red Red Meat: "Jimmymyname Majestic" (Sub Pop). Working out an obsession with sex as salvation, as need and angst all at once, is a kind of loneliness, this Chicago quartet is all about feel and interaction. This mood music can rock furiously, but at its most lumbous — in the wordless, fable of "Beneath" — it suggests a blurring of the boundaries between bliss and death.

8. Various artists: "1 AD (Ambient Dub Volume One)" (Waveform). An expertly programmed compilation of head music, combining the machine-driven ambience of techno with the hypnotic, bass-heavy rhythms of dub reggae.

9. Elvenking: "Divine Day" (Isis Major). (Atmospheric). In a year of unbridled success by Chicago rock bands, here's the best kept secret in town. "Isis Major" is a culmination in which the band crushes its influences and forges the most sophisticated and beautiful music of a nearly decade-old career.

10. Bonnie Raitt: "Longing in Their Heart" (Capitol). On a midlife road, Raitt has never made a better album. The tunes are lubricated with laid-back, Southern swing, while Raitt's bluesy voice pours on the honey. Her version of Richard Thompson's "Dimming of the Day" is a classic.

Runners-up: The Jesus Lizard, "Down" (Touch & Go); L7, "Lungry for Sin" (Slash); Sam Phillips, "Martins and Biscuits" (Virgin); Come, "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" (Matador); Daniel Johnston, "Fun" (Atlantic); Timbunctics, "Timbunctics" (BarNone); Neil Young, "Sleeps With Angels" (Reprise); Boyz II Men, "I'll Motown" (Shelby); Shellie at Action Park" (Touch & Go); Hole, "Live Through This" (DGC).

## Ex-Blondie singer Harry digs for her musical roots

The song sounds familiar if a bit more urgent. Contemporary.

"Toe to toe dancing, ve-ry close!"

As strobes flash and hips mash seductively at the midpoint of the moment, that high female soprano — equal parts crystal and intoxicants — sparks memory synapses. It's her, you think.

"I was co-ma-tose ..."

But why would the disc jockey play her alongside current club confessions by Madonna and A People? Clubs are into new music. Perhaps that last beer was the first of too many.

"Wall to wall people hyp-notized ..."

But there's no mistaking that midsonar, the one about the man from Mars who ate cars and bars.

"Each night in rap-tu-ruse ..."

It's true, Blondie's "Rapture," a 1980 track that helped introduce rap to a mainstream audience, is back. It's sporting a spiffy new mix (you can find it on Blondie's two-CD "Platinum Collection"), and it just jumped into the Top 10 on Billboard's Club Play chart.

But former Blondie lead singer Deborah Harry says Blondie's 1983 split is permanent. That's despite a string of four No. 1 singles — "Heart of Glass," "Call Me," "The Tide Is High" and, of course, "Rapture."

A couple of the guys aren't performing anymore, so I think it would be a bit of a stretch to expect someone to come out of total retirement to take on a job like that. I think what happens with bands is people move on and grow out of it or grow up," Harry, 49, said from the Bahamas, where she was recording vocals for an album by the Argentine band The

Fabulous Cadillacs. "I think drugs probably had a lot to do with changing personalities in the band. Things got a little bit warped."

## Comets still rockin' without Bill Haley

**JACKPOT** — Bill Haley and the Saddlemen became Bill Haley and the Comets — and began writing a new chapter in musical history.

Boasting 18 gold records and seven movies, the group recorded the kind of music that people started calling rock and roll. Some of the classics include "Shake Rattle and Roll," "See Ya Later Alligator" and the biggest selling record of all time, "Rock Around the Clock" (42 million copies).

"Rock a Beatin' Boogie," written by Haley himself, is characterized as the song that named rock and roll. Another Haley number, "Crazy Man Crazy," was the first rock and roll hit record ever.

Through the years, big stars such as John Lennon and Mick Jagger have said the sounds of Bill Haley and the Comets first sparked their interests in music. In the early '60s, at the Star Club in Hamburg, Germany, the Beatles were the opening act for the Comets. Elvis Presley had been the opening act before that.

In 1965, the band's current leader, John Lane, joined the Comets. He was 18 at the time, and Haley called him "Bum Bam."

## Pop princess-cum-country queen mulls change

**COSTA MESA, Calif.** — It's what agents like to call glove-fitting casting: Marie Osmond as Maria Rainer in "The Sound of Music" — America's squeaky-clean female pop/country star playing musical theater's most angelic heroine, the singing nun who loves children.

Consider the uncanny parallels that link Marie and Maria.

Maria — a woman raised in a large religious family unified by the power of music.

Maria — grows up with her brothers in the harsh glare of publicity that pop-music success brings.

Maria — marries into a family where children grew up under similar scrutiny.

Maria — lives in pretty, mountainous Utah. Loves the outdoors.

Maria — lived in pretty, mountainous Austria. Sang outdoors.

Maria — fresh-faced to a fault. Plays some guitar.

Maria — ditto.

But don't mention those similarities to Osmond, who brings her "altair" ego to southern California this week when "The Sound of Music" opens Tuesday at the Orange County Performing Arts Center. It runs through Jan. 8.

"I laugh when I'm asked that question," she said. The (von Trapp) family was dysfunctional. This guy (Captain Georg von Trapp) was in denial about everything because his wife had died. As a result, Osmond said, he was much harder on his children than her father was.

There are other glaring differences between the families Osmond and von Trapp, Osmond said.

"They used to get together and sing all the time. When we all got together, the last thing we want to do is sing."

There's one obvious quality that Marie couldn't deny she shares with Maria: spunk. She's done 400 performances in "The Sound of Music" in the past year; she's missed only five. And her exes are pretty damned good.

"Once I lost my voice because a doctor gave me an antibiotic that literally burned my larynx, so I couldn't go on that night, although I really wanted to," she said.

Osmond admitted she didn't know much about the von Trapp Family Singers before she began preparing for the role of Maria. But reading an account of the family and their travels filled her with respect for the musical nun, Osmond said.

"[I love] her positive approach to life, this spunk she has, this ability to make things work. In (a) naive way, she was a wonderful person ... a real lady."

Rodgers and Hammerstein's "The Sound of Music," which won seven Tonys and broke box-office records on Broadway when it opened in 1959, is based on the true tale of an Austrian nun/governess who teaches a family of children to sing, transforms their stern father into a pussycat, then marries him.

Almost as famous as the von Trapps' performances, of course,

was their daring escape from pre-war Austria to America, something which in Rodgers and Hammerstein's story is pulled off during a concert under the noses of watchful Nazis.

Osmond has done her von Trapp research well — she read Maria's autobiography, among other things — and she points out that reality is considerably less dramatic than that. "They simply took a train over the mountains," she said. "You do a few things for artistic effect."

One anecdote from Maria's autobiography particularly impressed Osmond.

"When they came over to the United States (Maria) was expecting a child. To be onstage (when you're pregnant) was considered an absolute no-no at the time."

"Well, she built herself a fat suit, with bigger arms and a bigger butt, to disguise the pregnancy. She wore it clear up, until she delivered."

Like Maria, Osmond has proven adept at balancing the demands of motherhood and performing on the road. She travels with her children, ages 3, 5, 7 and 11. Her oldest son, Stephen, even plays Kurt, one of the von Trapp children.

"My kids travel with me all the time," she said. "The more time we spend together, the better. I was raised on the road, and I learned that home isn't necessarily four walls. Home is children being with their parents and having wonderful experiences together."

"And they love the show — there are lots of other children here."

Osmond is anxious to dispel another notion about her role: She's not Julie Andrews. (Although Mary Martin originated the role of Maria, Andrews played her to legendary perfection in the ultra-successful 1965 film version.)

"I think Julie Andrews is incredibly talented. I saw the movie when I was a kid, of course. But I don't try to imitate her sound or her performance."

#### Jan. 16 deadline looms in settling NHL strike

**NEW YORK** — The two sides in the NHL labor dispute apparently have until Jan. 16 to start the season or lose it completely.

With the lockout of players completing its 90th day Thursday, the league informed the NHL Players Association in Toronto that if play does not begin by then, it will be impossible to play a 50-game season.

NHL commissioner Gary Bettman has said that's the minimum number of games he would consider, and that is the number of games at which the NHL Board of Governors has authorized him to cancel the season.

Bettman didn't issue a deadline to have a deal in place. But Jan. 6-8 appears likely since eight to 10 days would be required for ratification votes by both sides and for training camp to be held.

#### Eastern Michigan head coach to take over job at Louisville

**LOUISVILLE, Ky.** — Ron Cooper, who revitalized Eastern Michigan's football team, was hired as coach of Louisville on Thursday and promised to build on the success of Howard Schnellenberger.

Schnellenberger led Louisville to two bowl victories before resigning this month after 10 years to become coach at Oklahoma. Cooper, 33, signed a five-year contract with a base salary of \$100,000. He becomes the fifth black head football coach in NCAA Division I-A.

#### Nets' guard cites personal problems in missing practice

**TEANECK, N.J.** — Personal problems, not a benching in a blowout loss the previous night, caused Kenny Anderson to skip a New Jersey Nets practice, the All-Star guard said Thursday.

Anderson apologized to rookie coach Bruce Bredt for missing Wednesday's workout.

But Anderson did not say what the personal problems were, and he did not practice with the team Thursday because of a sore right shoulder.

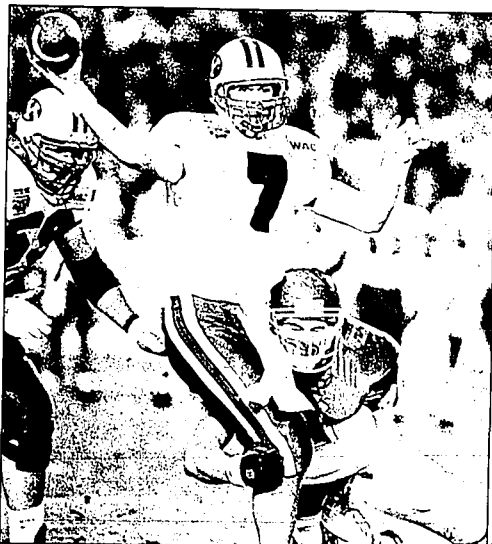

## Meridian spears Twin Falls at the end to earn 59-55 win

**TWIN FALLS** — Meridian scored first and last, and nothing else mattered as the Bruins fell to the Warriors 59-55 Thursday in a non-conference boys' basketball contest.

The Warriors (7-1) pipped a three-pointer within the first 10 seconds of the game and looked to give the Bruins a challenge.

But Kylan Peterson answered with five of his seven first-quarter points to put Twin Falls (3-4) up by one.

Both teams swapped baskets through the first quarter with Meridian taking a one-point lead.

But Leon answered with a missed free throw. With Meridian again at the line, Jeff Hymas's free throw fell off the rim. Twin Falls' Craig Swenson swished two charities to draw the Bruins within one with 36 seconds left.

The Bruins fooled Hymas again, but this time the junior connected on both, increasing the Warrior lead to three points.

With 10 seconds left, Twin Falls' Tyler Miller fired a three-pointer that fell short. Hymas nailed another free throw to seal the game with eight seconds.

"We lost because we didn't stop their transition," Peterson said. "Sometimes we put it all together and sometimes we don't."

Peterson ended the game with 19 points and 11 rebounds.

Leon added eight points and 10 rebounds for the Bruins.

The only player that scored in double figures for Meridian was Craig Waite who fired three three-pointers en route to 13 points.

## BYU blasts Oklahoma Sooners and later, 31-6

**TUCSON, Ariz.** John Walsh made Gary Gibbs' last game as Oklahoma's coach a nightmare, throwing for 454 yards and four touchdowns Thursday in leading No. 22 Brigham Young to a 31-6 win in the Copper Bowl.

Gibbs announced his resignation in November but chose to coach through the bowl game. Walsh may have made him wish he didn't stick around.

He threw a 43-yard completion on the first play of the game and didn't slow down. His wound up 31 of 45, setting a Copper Bowl record for completions and coming up just 22 short of the bowl's record for passing yards, set two years ago by Drew Hedecoe of Washington State.

The Cougars finished the year 10-3, their ninth 10-victory season in 23 years under coach Lavell Edwards. Oklahoma (6-6) saw its string of consecutive winning years end at 28.

Gibbs concluded his six years as head coach with a record of 44-23-2. He is being replaced by Howard Schnellenberger, who watched the game from a private box.

Brigham Young dominated from the start, controlling the clock with its passing game while Oklahoma struggled with quarterback Terence Brown. The sophomore played in place of Garrick McFie, who is recovering from illness, and the offense never got much going.

The Sooners didn't cross midfield until the final minute of the third quarter. Walsh threw two touchdowns apiece to Bryce Doman and Mike Johnston. The junior quarterback mixed things up beautifully, throwing to eight receivers, and hurt Oklahoma time and again by converting long-yardage situations into first downs.

Walsh completed 10 of his first 11 passes, and the only incompletion was a drop. He went through a stretch in the second quarter where he missed on four straight, but he made up for it with three big completions on the Cougars' second touchdown drive.

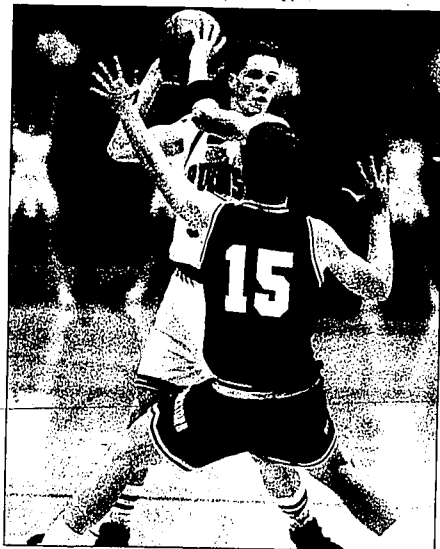

# Rose Bowl sizes up as the tale of two different quarterbacks

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Penn State's Kerry Collins looks like a quarterback made in heaven. Oregon's Danny O'Neil looks like your neighborhood grocery boy.

In O'Neil's case, looks can be deceiving. In his fourth year as Oregon's starting quarterback, he has the Ducks in their first Rose Bowl in 37 years. Along the way, he's buried some ghosts that haunted him throughout his college career.

"His face is young. He's got a slight build, but he is one of the toughest, most competitive athletes I've ever been around," Oregon coach Rich Brooks said. "He's taken more hits and gotten back up to play."

When Oregon's linebackers look across the line at the opposing quarterback on Monday, they'll be looking up. Collins stands 6-foot-5 and weighs 235 pounds.

"He's bigger than some of our linemen," Brooks said, exaggerating only slightly.

O'Neil is 6-2 and weighs 179. Collins is a first team All-American. He completed 67 percent of his passes for 2,679 yards and 21 touchdowns this season.

O'Neil is No. 2 behind: Bill Musgrave on Oregon's all-time passing list, but his statistics were way down this season.

He completed 50 percent for 1,756 yards. Still, he led the Pac-10 in touchdown passes with 20 and didn't throw an interception in his last four games.

Both Collins and O'Neil have known the wrath of fans. Both were booed earlier in their careers. As recently as the third game of this season, when Oregon lost at home to Utah, there were catcalls aimed at O'Neil as the game ended.

He consistently was compared unfavorably with the popular Musgrave, largely because he was 0-16 in games in which Oregon was behind at half-time.

time or felt behind in the second half. Then came the 98-yard drive against Washington that gave the Ducks the lead for good and the second half against Arizona, when he brought Oregon back from a 9-0 deficit. Finally, he brought his team from behind in the fourth quarter against Oregon State in the last game of the regular season.

Now O'Neil has Oregon in a place where the schools' other top quarterbacks — Musgrave, Chris Miller and Dan Fouts — never have been.

"He's put all those ghosts behind him," Brooks said. "Now people have put him in his rightful place as one of the all-time great quarterbacks to play at Oregon."

The irony that one of the most criticized quarterbacks ever at Oregon has them in the Rose Bowl isn't lost on O'Neil.

"That just shows you the ignorance of a lot of critics, all those people who put on paper or yelled in the stands about how bad I was or that I couldn't come from behind now have to suck up those words," he said.

O'Neil's big lesson came when he was sidelined with a rare staph infection on his right ring finger and missed the game at Southern Cal. Backup Tony Grazianni came on and led the Ducks to their first road win over the Trojans since 1973. Suddenly, O'Neil knew there were others on the team who could make big plays.

"He realized that he didn't have to do it all by himself, that there were other good players on this team," Brooks said.

O'Neil is deeply religious, and those convictions have served him well through the tough times when he was his own worst enemy.

"I want people to understand that if you continue to listen to the critics or the fans, you may become what they say," O'Neil said. "But if you continue to work hard and know what you can do, you're going to change something."

## Holiday Bowl means respect for Rams

SAN DIEGO — They are 10-1. They are ranked 10th in the nation.

Yet, outside the eastern foothills of the Rocky Mountains, not many think of Colorado State's Rams as a football powerhouse. Certainly not the folks in Ann Arbor, Mich., where the mighty Wolverines often start the season among the nation's first five.

Even in a down year, Gary Mueller's Michigan is a daring sight for a Western Athletic Conference champion, particularly one that has been to all of two bowls (Raisin and Freedom) in its less-than-storied football history.

So in the name of respectability, Colorado State will be aiming for a

victory Friday night when it faces the No. 20 Wolverines (7-4) in the Holiday Bowl at San Diego Jack Murphy Stadium. Kickoff is at 6 p.m.

"We're definitely not intimidated," Ram quarterback Anthony Hill said. "We've come too far for that. We worked from the bottom up."

The work began in 1993 with the arrival of Coach Sonny Lubik, who came from Miami to replace the controversial Earle Bruce. In Lubik's first season at Fort Collins, the Rams were 5-6. But they won their final three games

and have won 13 of 14, losing only to Utah in Salt Lake City. Win or lose Friday night, it has been an emotional ride for Lubik's Rams.

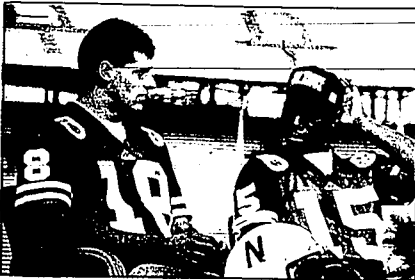
Michigan, on the other hand, needs a victory after ending the regular season with a 22-6 loss to Ohio State to finish third in the Big Ten. Another defeat would give Mueller his worst record since succeeding Bo Schemmeler in 1990.

Michigan has the big names and even bigger players. But Colorado State's offense is so unpredictable, the Rams cannot be discounted

because of a lack of size. "I wouldn't want them to get into an offensive battle with us," Hill warned.

The Wolverines have no intentions of such foolishness. This, despite an imposing offense that has solid running backs in Tyrone Wheatley, who had 1,064 yards and 11 touchdowns in nine games, and Tim Bakabutka, who had 713 yards and seven touchdowns in 10 games, and senior quarterback Todd Collins, who passed for 2,356 yards and 11 touchdowns, including 1,033 yards to receiver Amani Toomer.

Lubik is not quite sure how to stop Michigan. "When you think of stopping their running game, then they pass," he said. "They are a little more physical than anybody we faced this year."

## Nebraska taps Frazier as Orange Bowl starter

MIAMI (AP) — Tommie Frazier, who hasn't played in more than three months, will be top-ranked Nebraska's starting quarterback in the Orange Bowl. No one knows if he'll be there at the finish, though.

Answering the most asked question of the week, coach Tom Osborne announced Thursday that Frazier will start against No. 3 Miami instead of Brook Berringer, who was 7-0 as a starter after Frazier was sidelined by blood clots in late September.

Osborne said he picked Frazier because he played better in last Saturday's scrimmage, his first contest since the Pacific game on Sept. 24.

"I told them the scrimmage would be the big factor in who started," Osborne said during a hectic media gathering at the Orange Bowl. "Brook had a couple of turnovers and Tommie didn't have any. ... It was just the luck of the draw, almost like a coin toss."

Osborne said Berringer also will play. How much and when will depend on how the game goes.

"It could be a deal where one guy plays most of the time and the other guy plays a few series, or it could be 50-50," Osborne said. "We'll just play it by ear."

It will be the third Orange Bowl

start for Frazier, who played in losses to Florida State the past two years. Frazier, who is 20-3 as a starter, was considered a Heisman Trophy contender before getting blood clots in his right leg.

Both juniors were given the news at Thursday morning's practice.

"I wasn't surprised," Frazier said. "I felt all along that if I played well in the scrimmage, I might get a chance. ... I don't feel I've missed a step."

Berringer, who threw two interceptions in the scrimmage, took the decision in stride.

"I'm a little disappointed, of course, but I won't let that affect the way I play because I'll be in there in the first half," he said. "I expect to play well and I expect Tommie to play well."

Miami players said they don't care who starts for Nebraska, which has lost its last five games at the Orange Bowl.

"They could have Superman back there and they won't win," linebacker Ray Lewis said.

Blood clots can be life-threatening, but Frazier said he isn't worried about his health. Doctors have cleared him to play, and say there's little chance of another blood clot.

"I'm going to play with no fear," said Frazier, who has stopped taking blood-thinning drugs. "I'll give it my all."

ATLANTA (AP) — Grabbling's Eddie Robinson, who has more victories than any other college football coach, tries to make a notch closer to the 400 milestone Friday when his Tigers play South Carolina State in the Heritage Bowl.

Robinson, completing his 52nd season at Grambling, is 397-142-15.

At one point in the 1994 season, it appeared Robinson would be going for No. 400 in the Heritage Bowl. But after winning their first nine games while averaging 49.4 points, the Tigers lost 13-10 to Florida A&M and 34-7 to Southern University.

Both teams carry 9-2 records into the game — which begins at 11 a.m. MST at the Georgia Dome — with the Bulldogs riding a seven-game winning streak. Their last loss was to Tennessee State at the Georgia Dome, where they have gone 0-4 over the last three seasons.

"That's something we've talked about among ourselves," said South Carolina State defensive star Anthony Cook. "It's not like we've been blown out by anybody. It's just been the little things that have beaten us, a fumble or penalty at the wrong time. I think it'll be different this time."

**Sun Bowl coaches seek national spotlight**

EL PASO, Texas — As the coaches see it, this Sun Bowl is all about tradition.

John Mackovic of Texas wants to revive the Longhorns' custom of winning bowl games.

For North Carolina's Mack Brown, a victory in Friday's game would mean the No. 19 Tar Heels are on their way to establishing a national reputation.

"We're trying to get to where Texas and Alabama have been," Brown said. "We're trying to get where Florida State is ... right now."

Brown comes into the game on a postseason roll, having coached his team to three consecutive bowl berths, including this year. The Sun Bowl marks UNC's 19th bowl overall.

The Longhorns have a longer tradition, with 34 previous appearances and 16 victories.

But this year's Sun Bowl marks the Longhorns' first bowl since 1991 and only their third in the last five years.

"I see this not as the end of a journey, but rather as another bridge we have to cross on the way to building our program," Mackovic said.

But only one of these coaches will be able to achieve what he wants. The other will wind up with a long trip home and an even longer offseason to mull over a loss.

Each team already knows what a victory will entail.

The Tar Heels (8-3, 5-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) will need to crank up their powerful option running game, which sets up their cagey and dangerous play-action passes.

The Longhorns (7-4, 4-3 Southwest Conference) will need to counter with their prolific, big-play passing attack, knowing good aerial offenses have hurt UNC in the past.

As it has shaped up, it would seem the game will be a strong offensive battle.

The Tar Heels will likely be led at quarterback by both Jason Stanicek, a scrambler with a good command of UNC's option offense, and Mike Thomas, a good deep passer.

Stanicek, a record-setter for UNC, completed 96 of 166 passes for 1,222 yards and seven touchdowns this season, but was plagued by injuries.

When he went down, Thomas stepped in. He completed 39 of 83 for 715 yards and eight TDs.

## Freshman QB takes Baylor team to Alamo Bowl

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — With freshman quarterback Jeff Watson leading the way, Baylor has broken school scoring records, grabbed a share of the Southwest Conference title and earned a berth in the Alamo Bowl.

Now the Bears have their sights on another feat — overcoming the experienced, highly acclaimed defense of No. 24 Washington State.

"We've got our hands full," Baylor offensive coordinator Clark Crowe said Thursday. "I mean, they're pretty good. Those boys are pretty good."

Baylor and Washington State, both 7-4, met Saturday night in the second annual Alamo Bowl.

With nine starting seniors, the Washington State defense is ranked second nationally. The Cougars allowed an average of 229 yards per game and led the Pac-10 Conference in pass defense, scoring defense and total defense.

"They have a great defense," Watson said of the 5-point favorite. "You can't be intimidated by them, but

# Indicators show gain, foreshadow slowdown

WASHINGTON — After remarkably strong growth in 1994, the U.S. economy will slow next year but avoid a recession, the government's forecasting gauge suggests.

The Commerce Department said Thursday that its Index of Leading Economic Indicators posted a 0.2 percent gain in November. The increase followed a 0.1 percent decline in October, the first setback in 15 months.

While the November gain was better than expected, analysts said that for the past six months the performance of the index has clearly been signaling a slowdown in growth but as yet, no outright downturn.

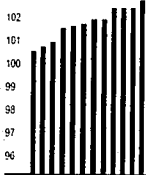
The leading indicators don't suggest a recession but there are clear indications that the economy will slip into a pattern of low growth next year.

Many analysts are forecasting that growth next year, as measured by the gross domestic product, will be below 3

percent. That would be significantly lower than the 4 percent GDP rate expected for 1994, a year in which the economy created more than 3 million new jobs, pushing unemployment down

to a four-year low of 6.6 percent.

That growth was fed by a surge in consumer spending for homes, autos, and other big-ticket items.

However, that rapid growth, coming in the fourth year of an economic recovery, spurred the Federal Reserve to launch an aggressive effort to boost interest rates to dampen demand and stave off higher inflation.

Analysts said there were hints in the November leading index report that this effort was starting to bear fruit with interest-sensitive sectors such as housing permits showing weakness.

In a second report Thursday, the Labor Department said that claims for unemployment benefits dropped to 3,000 last week as 322,000 Americans filed initial claims at unemployment offices.

That report was in line with other indicators that 1994 was ending at an extremely rapid clip. That strength will likely prompt the Fed to boost interest rates for a seventh time at their next meeting in late January, analysts said.

But they were split on whether there would be further rate hikes after that.

Some argued that mounting signs of a slowdown will prompt the Fed to remain on the sidelines for the rest of 1995, but others said that rising concerns about inflation will force the central bank to raise rates at least two more times after January.

"While inflation has been tame up until now, we will see clear signs of accelerating price pressures in 1995," said Mark Zandi, an economist at Westchester, Pa. "That means the pressure on the Fed will become unbearable and it will have to raise rates more aggressively."

All economists agreed that the greatest danger to the current recovery is that the Fed will overdo its credit tightening and tip the country into recession.

They said that increasing talk by President Clinton and Republicans in Congress of a middle class tax cut heightened their recession concerns because such economic stimulus would be inflationary for an economy already operating close to full capacity.

## Mixed stock finish wraps up quiet session

NEW YORK — Stocks ended a quiet session on a mixed note Thursday, weathering a downturn in bonds but getting a boost from a stronger dollar, a rise in technology issues and more signs of stability in Mexico.

On the next-to-last day of the trading year, the Dow Jones industrial average ended down 0.66 points at 3,853.43 after a late bout of selling. The blue-chip index stayed within a 15-point range all day.

Declining issues edged advances on the New York Stock Exchange by 1,162 to 1,088. Volume was light, as many investors were absent ahead of the New Year holidays. On the Big Board, 250.55 million shares changed hands, up from 243.42 million Wednesday.

Broad market indexes managed modest gains, largely on the strength of technology issues. The NYSE's composite index rose 0.15 to 351.41. The Standard & Poor's 500-stock index rose 0.30 to 461.16.

The Nasdaq composite index rose 7.07 to 749.53. The American Stock Exchange's market value index rose 1.74 to 431.36.

Elsewhere overseas, stock markets were mixed. The Nikkei index in Tokyo closed up 0.44 percent, while Frankfurt's DAX index lost 1.32 percent. London's FT-SE 100 index finished down 0.98 percent.

Bonds started the day in the positive column, drifted down as much as a point but then recovered somewhat, trading late in the day down 1-16 point and yielding 7.84 percent.

"How do I get my partner to slow down?" asks a reader. "We lose baskets of points because of his hasty and impulsive play."  
 As an example, our reader offers today's hand, in which "Mr. Speedy" called for a low card from dummy before the entire dummy was spread.

West led his spade seven to indicate lack of high-card strength in the suit (Journalist Leads) and North tabbed his spade suit first. Automatically, South called for a low card and East's king won. Instead of returning the suit, East shifted accurately to hearts. South held off for two rounds, but it didn't help. Eventually, he tried the diamond finesse and went one down.

The game makes easily had South won dummy's spade ace at trick one and taken the diamond finesse. Once the diamonds are established, only a heart shift by West could hold South to nine tricks. Any other lead would result in an overrnick.

What advice does he get from this corner? When dummy, our reader should put the other three suits down before exposing the suit led.

Last, and with reluctance, he puts down the suit led. There's no guarantee this procedure will improve his partner's play, but it will prevent partner from playing any card before the entire dummy is exposed.

# 'Fudge' tastes just as sweet on television

Farley Drexel Hatcher is a big name for a grown man, let alone a 4-year-old. So his family calls him Fudge.

Fudge and his family are the creations of contemporary children's author Judy Blume, whose 21 books are a staple of school libraries, teachers' bookshelves and backpacks everywhere. And Fudge is perhaps the best-known of her characters, a sort of code word among young "litani."

The saga of Fudge began with "Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing," in which the main character was ostensibly Fudge's older brother, Peter. But with its sequels, "Fudge," "Superfudge" and "Fudge-A-Mania," Blume came clean with her audience, admitting that Peter's little brother, the "human hurricane," was the real prime mover in her story.

Yet Peter is essential in his way, too. He is the story's narrator - the guide on the roller-coaster ride that his life with Fudge. Their parents couldn't do it; they'd just be too sappy. And Fudge, even if he could write, simply won't sit still long enough.

Blume's books are so popular that it is somewhat surprising that no one has attempted to adapt them for the screen until now. The explanation must be that the first generation of Blume fans is just reaching maturity.

But with a new year come at least a few improvements on the old life, and one of these is "Fudge-A-Mania," a small-screen version of Blume's fourth Fudge novel, debuting Saturday, Jan. 7, on "The ABC Family Movie."

# Quality dramas, weird events dominated '94 TV

If 1994 threw television for a loop, then 1995 could be a continuous Tilt-A-Whirl.

Consider just two events set in motion this year: TV's nonstop O.J. Simpson coverage and Fox's May day raid of mostly CBS stations. It seems as though they've been with us forever, but they'll come to a boil in 1995.

Even so, this has been a year of landmark, chain-reaction change. Fox, the cunning beast headed by Rupert Murdoch, took both pro football and big-market stations away from the most storied network in the land. CBS and its other competitors responded by cutting their own new station deals.

The Earth shook and hasn't stopped. Seemingly rock-solid network/affiliate station relationships, many dating to the dawn of television, have been sent tumbling by high-rollers in search of profits without honor. Or to quote NBC president Don Ohlmeyer: "Rupert Murdoch is coming in, and he's screwing up this entire business. ... All of these forces are tearing into the very fabric of network television."

Nonetheless, in '94 the fabric was made of better-quality cloth. Hourlong drama series enjoyed a modern-day Golden Age, while news magazine se-

ries saw their ratings suddenly tarnish. "ER," "Chicago Hope" and the soon-to-expire "My So-Called Life" joined an already impressive crop, including "Naked Fences," "NYPD Blue," "Homicide: Life on the Street," "Law & Order" and "Let's be charitable ... Northern Exposure." In the face of such splendor, quickie Rosanne and Tom movies by NBC and Fox were megaflops, despite the heavy publicity preceding them.

But TV's good side often intersected with the twisting road leading to Simpson's murder trial. "Hard Copy" and "Gerardo" gleefully pounced, of course. But the mainstream news shows were equally voracious, segueing from Tonya/Nancy to O.J./Nicole with the ease of Wink Martindale taking on a new game show. Under the circumstances, Connie Chung did what she had to do: "exclusive" interviews with both Tonya Harding and an O.J. basher peddling a bookful of fantasies.

The year brought a quieting to the once-raging debate about TV violence. Members of Congress milled for a while and then seemed to poop out on the issue.

Bullish visions of the electronic "superhighway" became clouded after financial realities and viewer resistance kicked in.

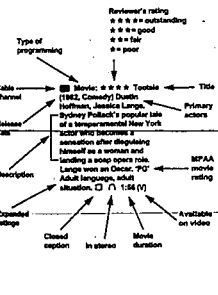

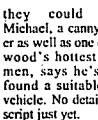
A: You may have forgotten a made-for-TV movie of this property back in 1973, 26 years after the original heart-warmer was released.

# Snyder is back on network because he's all talk

Tom Snyder claims not to know the secret of talk-show success.

"If I knew I could bottle it and sell it, I would," says the 58-year-old veteran of TV gab, speaking from Los Angeles.

But he must know something because more than 20 years after he started his now-famous nine-year stint on NBC's "Tomorrow" show, Snyder is still considered one of the premiere figures in the field.

That's why, on Jan. 9, Snyder will move his live mike and his entertainingly mannered brand of interviewing from cable's CNBC to CBS — where he will host "The Late Late Show With Tom Snyder" weeknights following David Letterman.

Ironically, it was Letterman — now the undisputed king of late-night television — who displaced Snyder and "Tomorrow" on NBC in 1982. So when CBS went for a companion show and host to follow their sleepy-time franchise, few industry observers thought of Snyder, assuming to a large degree that the network would look for a younger host, a comedian to go head to head with NBC's Conan O'Brien.

But it was Snyder who came up with the job. And it's all thanks to what he calls a bit of "bird luck."

It all started about a year ago — as a joke, in fact on an episode of HBO's "The Larry Sanders Show." In a spoof of the then much-in-the-news talk-show star, Sanders (series star Garry Shandling) was trying to steal Snyder away from Letterman, who was supposedly considering the interviewer for the job Snyder will now occupy.

"All of a sudden," says Snyder, "people started writing about it (and) what pleased me was everybody seemed to think it was a pretty good idea."

Snyder, however, was

surprised to get the job. "Of course, I was surprised," he says, adding, "I wasn't looking for this."

He says he even has guilt pangs about leaving

CNBC. "It was a positive experience," he says.

Snyder is not complaining, though. He appreciates all the extra bells and whistles and viewers he'll be bringing

in over the satellite and in trainings.

One thing that will not change, he promises, is the show.

What you've seen is what you'll get.

"Tom is Tom and that's what everybody bought," he says.

Asked to describe his brand of talk show, Snyder emphasizes his "free-wheeling" nature.

"I don't have an agenda," he explains. "I just go out there and tell what I saw or tell what happened or tell what people tell me. I've always had a good facility for that."

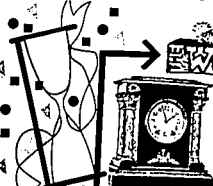

Most of South America is in the Southern Hemisphere. The seasons south of the equator are opposite from ours. The equator divides the hemispheres.



South America is surrounded by water. It is connected to Central America by the Isthmus of Panama. (An isthmus is a thin strip of land linking two larger land areas.)

• The Andes Mountains are called the backbone of South America. At 4,500 miles long, the Andes are the longest mountain range in the world.

• Lake Titicaca between Bolivia and Peru is the world's highest lake that people regularly sail across.

• The Atacama Desert along Chile's coast is one of the driest places on Earth.

• The Pampas are a great, fertile, flat area of Argentina where cattle and wheat are raised.

• Patagonia in Argentina is a dry, barren, windswept area. The few people who live here often raise sheep.

• Cape Horn is at the tip of the continent. Before the Panama Canal was built, ships had to sail around the cape.

• The Llanos are grassy, flat areas suitable for raising cattle.

• Angel Falls in Venezuela is the highest waterfall in the world.

• Dense tropical forests and grassy lands cover these highlands. Not many people live in this area.

• The Amazon River is the second-longest river in the world. It drains the world's largest river basin and contains more water than any river on Earth.

• The tropical rain forest along the Amazon River is the largest jungle in the world. It has the world's largest variety of plants.

• These highlands are rolling hills, where mines, ranches and coffee plantations are located.

• Rio de Janeiro in Brazil has one of the few natural harbors, or bays. The continent does not have many wide, flat coastal areas.

• The Gran Chaco is a big area with a few scrubby trees. The trees are cut for telephone poles and tannin, a substance used to tan leather.

• The Falkland Islands are one of the few offshore islands. They belong to Great Britain. Sheep are raised here.



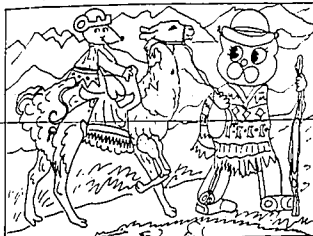

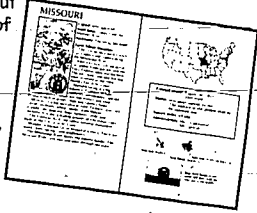
