# Judges approve wolf release

## Idaho-bound animals to go free today

TWIN FALLS — Last-ditch legal efforts by the American Farm Bureau Federation and Mountain States Legal Foundation to block the release of gray wolves in Idaho failed Thursday night after a federal appellate court ruled the wolves could be set free.

The Idaho-bound wolves spent Thursday night in Missoula, Mont., and could not be released into the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness until today. Federal plans allow the release of 11 more wolves in Idaho this year.

Eight other wolves were turned loose in one-acre enclosures inside Yellowstone National Park Thursday night.

All 12 wolves were caged at 11 a.m. Wednesday. The animals were kept in small metal shipping crates for more than 36 hours — without food and water — as legal disputes swirled around them.

"Some of the animals are already showing signs of stress, biting at their cages, and possibly injuring their teeth and mouths," federal attorneys said in papers filed with the 10th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver.

The wolves were captured in the Canadian province of Alberta, then flown to Great Falls, Mont. on Wednesday. At 2:30 a.m. Thursday, the Yellowstone wolves were loaded onto trucks and driven to America's oldest national park.

Gray wolves roamed wild in the northern Rockies until hunting and trapping pushed them to the brink of extinction. They have been federally listed as an endangered species for more than two decades, but serious efforts to restore them to Idaho and Yellowstone began in 1991.

Wildlife biologists say wolves could help off the endangered species list by

2002, at an estimated cost of about \$6.7 million.

In Denver Thursday, federal attorneys pleaded with judges to allow the Yellowstone wolves to be released into the pens. The aluminum transport crates measure 2 feet by 3 feet by 4 feet, and do not permit occupants to be fed or watered, federal attorneys said.

Thursday's decision cheered Idaho wolf advocates.

"It was clear the Farm Bureau's first attempt was based on myth, and anecdotes, and no good science," said David Langhorst, executive director of the

Ketchum-based Wolf Education Research Center. "The court saw through their shallow ruse."

Last week, a federal district judge in Wyoming denied an injunction to halt the release.

Wolf opponents waited a week to try again, said U.S. Justice Department attorney M. Alice Thurston, "and filed their motion only after the government began to transport the wolves."

"To permit (them) to use this tactic of delay to jeopardize the program — at great harm to the wolves and at great cost to the

# Batt accepts Navy nuclear waste for storage

BOISE — When the U.S. Navy sends eight radioactive shipments of spent nuclear fuel to Idaho later this year, Gov. Phil Batt won't stand in front of the trains — or challenge the shipments in court as former Gov. Cecil Andrus did.

Thursday, Batt said he'll accept the shipments to bolster the nation's military — and honor Idaho's commitment to nuclear storage. Trains

carrying the toxic material will be crossing Idaho within six weeks — destined for the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory near Idaho Falls.

The prospect of more nuclear waste in Idaho troubles state Sen. Clint Stennett, D-Ketchum, despite promises that the storage won't be permanent.

"If we bring that stuff in, it's not going anywhere," Stennett predicted. Nuclear waste will be around at INEL long after Batt — and the Legislature — are gone, he said.

One massive earthquake, one meltdown could imperil the Magic Valley, Stennett said. "The wind blows in Idaho and it blows hard, fast and furious. One accident, one major incident could contaminate all of eastern Idaho" and the Snake River aquifer, he added.

State Rep. Wendy Jaquet, D-Ketchum, said she preferred Andrus' approach to nuclear waste storage. "I really respect what Cecil Andrus did — he put his foot down and said, 'No more.'"

Jaquet said outsiders — who view Idaho as "nothing but sagebrush" — will keep sending nuclear waste as long as they can get away with it. "If INEL was in downtown Sacramento, it sure would be a different situation, wouldn't it?"

An August 1993 contract signed by Andrus and Navy representatives bound Idaho to accept the waste, Batt insisted at a Statehouse news conference. "Apparently it was Cecil Andrus, who had been challenging

# Conservative groups urge Congress to sell off national forest, park tracts

WASHINGTON — Leaders of conservative think tanks and free-market economists are urging Congress to cut back on U.S. environmental regulations and sell vast tracts of national forests, national parks and federal tribal lands.

The testimony came Wednesday before the House panel that oversees the Forest Service, Interior and Energy Departments. "This is an area of the budget where you should take a chain saw," said Stephen Moore, director of fiscal policy studies at the Cato Institute.

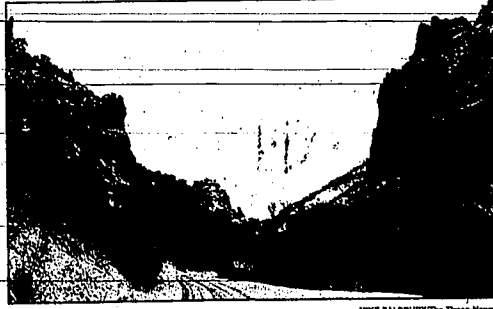
"There is no reason for the federal government to play landlord over vast stretches of the West," added Jerry Taylor, the institute's director of natural resource studies.

Representatives for the Heritage Foundation, Citizens for a Sound Economy and Citizens Against Government Waste also appeared before the new GOP-controlled panel.

In recent years, under Democratic control, the subcommittee had opened the new year with testimony from dozens of environmental groups.

"This is some of the most stimulating testimony I've heard in 18 years in Congress," said Rep. Bob Livingston, R-La., chairman of the full House Appropriations Committee.

Rep. Ralph Regula, R-Ohio, chairman of the subcommittee, called it "provocative." Reps. Barbara Vucowich, R-New; and Charles Taylor, R-N.C., both said it was "refreshing."

Jim Waltman, wildlife specialist for the National Audubon Society, said his group had not yet been invited to testify before the subcommittee. He said the government "can save money by ending subsidies to the logging, mining and livestock grazing industries."

The groups testifying on Wednesday urged Congress to:

- Abolish the Energy Department, giving its nuclear weapons responsibilities to the Defense Department and nuclear waste clean up duties to the Environmental Protection Agency.

Merge the nation's land management agencies, give federal land back to the states, implement entrance fees at national forests and raise existing fees at national parks.

End federal support for the arts and cultural programs.

Thomas Schatz, president of Citizens Against Government Waste, said the National Park Service has become "the National Pork Service" because of the pork-

# Ex-Haitian officer kills U.S. soldier

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — A former Haitian army officer shot and killed a U.S. soldier at a military checkpoint Thursday.

It was the first American death from a hostile fire in Haiti.

A second American soldier was wounded before the gunman was shot and killed, said U.S. Embassy spokesman Stan Schrage.

The gunman was a passenger in a white pickup truck that ran a checkpoint just after noon in the village of Bigot, about 100 miles north of the capital, Schrage said.

Two U.S. soldiers in a Humvee chased the truck, and then approached on foot when it stopped, he said. The Haitian gunman emerged shooting, killing one soldier and wounding the other.

A third American soldier arrived at the scene and shot and killed the gunman, he said. The names of the American soldiers weren't released.

"Apparently it was a criminal activity and not directed at the U.S.," Schrage said.

An angry crowd pursued and captured the driver of the truck, who tried to flee on foot, said Gerarde Elyse of the Haitian district where the shooting occurred.

## New England shivers while Midwest skids, California soaks

'Bitter cold had a grip on parts of New England and freezing rain fell in the Midwest Thursday.  
Strong wind bowled in the West's higher elevations. Gusts over 70 mph were reported in the northern Sierra Nevada.  
Freezing rain persisted in the upper Midwest and parts of the Northeast. Milder air in the Northeast changed sleet and freezing rain to rain, though parts of New England received snow, including a foot in Boston.  
Fog caused delays or cancellations of flights in Boston, Warwick, R.I., Madison, Detroit and Chicago.  
Temperatures were frigid in northern Maine and New Hampshire, mostly in the 20s and 30s. Snow and freezing rain weakened heavy on Connecticut highways.  
Temperatures were mild in portions of the South, with highs of 79 in Camden, Conway, El Dorado and Fort Smith in Arkansas. Ohio enjoyed a winter warm wave Thursday.

government and the public at large — would reward (their) dilatory and disrespectful motions practice," she said.  
However, William Perry Pendley, president of Mountain States, told the Associated Press that the groups did not want to seek the stay.  
"We went in as soon as we could, we had to scramble to prepare something for the 10th [Circuit] Court," Pendley said.  
"In Boise, frustrated reporters from as far away as Washington, D.C. charged that Thursday's scheduled release had been halted. Many scrambled to fly, or drive, to Salmon — where the Idaho wolves will arrive en route to their release at the Indian Creek Guard Station.  
Koch fielded questions patiently, but he, too, seemed frustrated by the delay.  
"We've been through four years of planning on this, including a record level of involvement from the public," he sighed. According to an independent poll by Boise State University, 72 percent of Idaho's residents favor the return of gray wolves.

Federal officials on the waste issue since October 1988, advised Navy brass last month that he would not take spent reactor fuel beyond 19 shipments specified in a 1993 federal court order.  
Batt said Thursday that fighting the shipments would have harmed military preparedness and "injured national defense."  
"I do believe this is a national defense emergency," Batt told the press.

# Top GOP may not go all the way

WASHINGTON (AP) — At Republican events, "Newt for President" buttons are already a hit. The new House speaker is easily the hottest commodity in American politics today. But don't bet on his making a White House run anytime soon.

There are plenty of reasons Gingrich is most unlikely to join the 1996 GOP fray: He has dreamed for years of being speaker; his ethics are under constant attack; his shoot-from-the-hip style is a source of almost daily commotion.

And, all that aside, as a history buff it's not lost on him that the same Republican James Garfield in 1880 has a sitting House member been elected to the presidency.

Still, Gingrich's shadow is everywhere in GOP affairs, not only as Republicans try to pass passage of the agenda that helped them to a resounding victory in 1994 but also as they look to the 1996 presidential cycle.

Thursday night, for example, Gingrich was among the "amigos"

related to be at the table as Jack Kemp met with long-time political allies to ponder whether he should seek the GOP nomination.

And his presence is frequently felt elsewhere in the early 1996 jockeying, despite his repeated requests that the party's White House hopes lie low for six months or so — so he can push his agenda without distraction.

That request is seen by many Republicans as part of Gingrich's pique to reshape the party in his image.

"He has an interest in keeping the presidential campaign down the road because he is at this time the party's leader," said GOP strategist Eddie Mahe, a Gingrich ally. "When presidential candidates emerge, their voices

will become bigger than his because they have a bigger national platform."

It remains to be seen whether Gingrich will try to have a direct impact on the 1996 race. He said in one recent interview that he would be proud to serve as speaker for a Bob Dole presidency, but he hastened to add that there were other fine prospects.

With a dedicated following among House Republicans; particularly younger members elected in 1992 and 1994, Gingrich could have major influence if he sided with a candidate, some in the party believe. But the impact might not be as great as the risk of picking sides and losing. Rep. Richard Gephardt, after all, had deep support among House Democrats when he sought his party's nomination in 1988, but his candidacy was short-lived.

On the other hand, Gingrich's indirect influence could be enormous. "He has more input in defining the future of the Republican Party than

any individual inside or outside Washington," said Ed Geaers, a prominent GOP pollster. "Because of his influence, he is in a position to sit back and mold the themes and messages of all the campaigns."

Former Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alexander, for example, drew considerable attention last year as he laid the groundwork for his presidential candidacy by promoting a proposal to cut the pay of Congress — and the time it is in session — in half. Now, however, with Republicans in the majority and Gingrich pushing his busy agenda, Alexander's idea has far less appeal to conservatives.

Another example came at last weekend's presidential straw poll at the Louisiana GOP convention. Texas Sen. Phil Gramm, the most aggressive GOP candidate at this early date, repeatedly referred to Gingrich's "Contract With America" as the party's guiding document.

# Daughter of Malcolm X charged in killing plot

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — A daughter of Malcolm X was charged Thursday with trying to hire a hitman to kill her father's rival, Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan.

Qubilah Shabazz, 34, who was with her father when he was murdered nearly 30 years ago and whose family has long suspected Farrakhan's involvement in the assassination, surrendered Thursday morning. She faces charges of using the telephone and crossing state lines in the course of trying to hire the hitman, U.S. Attorney David Lillehaug said.

Shabazz was released on \$10,000 bail during a brief court appearance before Magistrate Jonathan Lebedoff on Thursday afternoon. A second hearing was scheduled for Wednesday.

Lebedoff told Shabazz to keep in touch with authorities and stay within Minnesota. He also appointed an attorney to represent her when she indicated she needed one.

The nine-count indictment against Shabazz follows a seven-month FBI investigation. If convicted, she could be sentenced to 30 years in prison and fined \$2.25 million.

Prosecutors said before the hearing they had no plans to insist that Shabazz be held until trial.

because she has been cooperating with authorities.

"We have been in contact with her and her attorneys this last week," Lillehaug said. "She has voluntarily checked into the courthouse each day. She surrendered voluntarily today."

Shabazz, formerly of New York City, has lived in Minneapolis since September.

The indictment said eight phone conversations occurred in July and August, and that Shabazz traveled from New York to Minnesota. After arriving, she made a partial payment to the person she hired to kill the 61-year-old Farrakhan, the indictment said. It said the killing was to occur in Illinois, where Farrakhan lives.

The identity of the person allegedly hired to kill Farrakhan was not disclosed in the indictment. At a news conference, Lillehaug said the would-be hitman was not believed to be a member of the Nation of Islam.

He said the person is cooperating and is expected to be a trial witness.

# Dole perched on White House bid

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole stepped out of the White House on Thursday, forming a presidential fund-raising committee and promising a final decision by early April.

"I believe we must rein in the government at home and reassert American leadership abroad," the Kansas Republican said in announcing formation of the Dole for President Exploratory Committee.

"I haven't yet officially thrown my hat in the ring, but you could say this is the first step," said Dole. "I am deeply honored by the outpouring of support, and it's time to give our donors and volunteers a vehicle for getting involved early."

Dole promised a final decision in late March or early April, and several of his political advisers said all signs pointed to a Dole candidacy. Before their official announcements, presidential hopefuls often form exploratory committees to get a head start on fund raising — and to signal potential supporters of

their intentions.

By the time Dole makes things official, Texas Sen. Phil Gramm and former Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alexander are likely to be formal candidates.

Gramm's announcement is scheduled for Feb. 24, and Alexander plans to officially declare a week or so later.

Dole and Gramm have had a bumpy relationship, particularly over the past year as the Texan tried to position himself as the leading force behind the defeat of President Clinton's health care plan, often rushing to the Senate floor for attack speeches without giving the GOP leader's office the traditional notice.

But Gramm issued a statement Thursday saying, "I love and admire Bob Dole, and I know that he will be a formidable contender.

Republicans are united in their commitment to beat Bill Clinton and complete the revolution we started in the 1994 elections."

Former Vice President Dan Quayle could well be an official candidate within weeks, too, and in recent days has signed on several operatives and begun to sound out GOP fund-raisers.

In a traditional year, the formal candidate announcements would not come until this fall. But a new, front-loaded primary calendar and Clinton's political weaknesses have combined to propel the 1996 campaign to an extraordinarily early start.

Others considering seeking the GOP nomination include Jack Kemp, the former housing secretary and unsuccessful 1988 presidential contender. Kemp was of GOP lawmakers who are close political advisers, but aides said they did not expect any immediate announcement of his plans. Of late, many advisers have read Kemp's ambivalence as a sign he would not run.

# Panel: Lawyer ads help poor people

WASHINGTON (AP) — For most of this century, the American Bar Association's vigorous opposition to lawyer advertising led states to ban it.

Now, an ABA commission says such ads help poor people find legal help and should not be regulated too harshly.

A soon-to-be-released report by the ABA Commission on Advertising says the legal profession still "strongly believes that advertising contributes to the decline of the profession's image."

But cracking down on lawyer ads may not help that image as much as "enhanced efforts to pursue and prosecute corruption within the profession and the judiciary, improve client relations, (and) limit use of the adversary system," the 216-page report says.

# White House ponders wage adjustment

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Clinton's advisers are considering whether to recommend adjusting the minimum wage automatically each year to restore earnings eroded by inflation, a senior administration official said Thursday.

Clinton confirmed this week that an increase in the wage floor is under consideration at the White House, but said he is awaiting recommendations from his economic advisers before making any decision.

The minimum wage has not been changed since it was raised to \$4.25 an hour in 1991. Any change must be approved by Congress.

Several aides have suggested increases in steps, eventually rising to \$5 an hour.

But some of Clinton's advisers also are recommending indexing the wage annually to make up for losses to rising prices, said the administration official, who spoke on condition of anonymity. Some other government benefits, including Social Security, already are adjusted annually.

Any indexing with the minimum wage faces formidable challenges in the Republican-led Congress where House Majority Leader Richard Armitage, R-Texas, advocates eliminating the minimum wage entirely. Ranking Republicans have said raising the wage floor is improbable.

They and other critics contend that increasing the wage often results in lost jobs because of added employment costs.

Reno eyes law to curb violence at clinics

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department is considering whether new legislation is needed to curb anti-abortion violence, Attorney General Janet Reno said Thursday.

"What we have tried to do, particularly since the Brookline incident, is again to see whether there are any possible revisions," Reno told her weekly news conference. "At this point, I've not heard of any that those who are on the front line in terms of enforcing the (clinic-access) statute feel that would be helpful, but I want to keep an open mind and make sure that I've addressed all possibilities."

She ordered another review of legislative needs, particularly possible revisions in the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act of 1994, after two people were killed and five wounded Dec. 30 in attacks on two Brookline, Mass., clinics.

John C. Salvi III, a 22-year-old hairdresser, pleaded innocent to federal gun charges and state murder charges in the Brookline case. Reno said she was awaiting a report from Donald K. Stern, U.S. attorney in Boston, before deciding whether to file additional charges against Salvi that could carry a death penalty.

Reno said she would not decide whether to seek new legislation or amendments until hearing from the criminal and civil rights divisions and the Justice task force investigating the possibility of a national conspiracy behind clinic violence.

Abortion-rights groups have suggested the clinic-access law does not adequately address incidents of violence. But Reno said she had not received any such complaints from federal prosecutors and noted a court in Kansas City this month issued a restraining order against one abortion protester based on spoken threats as well as actions.

Justice spokesman Carl Stern said initial questions about legislation came from abortion rights advocates. They asked if a federal guard force could be created for clinics since there are not enough U.S. marshals to cover all 4,000, he said.

Genetics may boost ethanol

WASHINGTON (AP) — The bug that gave you a buzz at the bar may soon power the taxi that takes you home, help clean the air you breathe, and make your garbage useful.

That's the promise in the work of researchers who used some genetic engineering to help ferment a natural substance called hemicellulose — a process necessary for efficient mass production of ethanol, or grain alcohol.

"It's not unlike the fermentation that is used to make alcoholic beverages," said Stephen Picataggio, one-of-five researchers whose work is described in a paper published in this week's Science magazine. "Alcoholic beverages have to come from a grain that is food grade. In this case, it doesn't have to be."

So, instead of a drinking-grade alcohol, the researchers produced an environment-conscious fuel.

Ethanol already is in limited use as a fuel, most often blended with gasoline. "Companies are contacting us about possible applications," said Charles W. Wyman, director of the alternative fuel division at a Department of Energy laboratory in Golden, Colo. "This is a step toward making ethanol more competitive for blending applications; this is a big step."

Wyman said the magnitude of energy sources made available through the new process for conversion to ethanol is "potentially enough to replace all gasoline."

Researchers at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory genetically engineered a strain of a bacterium called Zymomonas mobilis. In its new state it can produce ethanol from all the sugars — not just some, as before — found in agricultural residues such as corn fiber, sawdust and other forestry residues, and energy crops grown specifically to be converted to ethanol.

Clinton weighs in for line-item veto

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration made clear for the first time Thursday that it favors dramatically strengthening the president's ability to kill individual items in spending bills.

Since his election campaign in 1992, President Clinton has repeatedly said he wants to see an increase in that power, which is called a line-item veto. But it had been unclear whether he favors only a slight strengthening, like many congressional Democrats prefer, or a major boost like many Republicans want.

On Thursday, White House Budget Director Alice Rivlin eliminated any lingering doubts.

"He supports passage of the strongest version of the line-item veto, one which ensures that he can cut unnecessary spending, reduce the budget deficit and fight attempts by special interests to fund wasteful projects at taxpayers' expense," Rivlin told a hearing of the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee and the House Government Reform and Oversight Committee.

Her comments strengthened the likelihood that there will be bipartisan cooperation in passing line-item veto legislation this year, one of the Republicans' top priorities. The strongest opposition is likely to come from Sen. Robert Byrd, D-W.Va., an ardent defender of congressional power.

House Republicans made the idea part of their campaign "Contract With America," which has become their legislative agenda since winning control of Congress. Several versions have sprouted on Capitol Hill.

The major House version of the bill would let the president veto individual items in spending bills and special interest tax cuts that would affect five people or fewer. Congress could overturn the veto only with a two-thirds majority, a threshold difficult to attain.

A similar measure sponsored by Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., would apply solely to spending legislation.

Baker warns GOP on foreign policy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The face and the Texas twang were unmistakably James A. Baker III. But much of what he said Thursday about U.S. foreign policy could have come from President Clinton or Secretary of State Warren Christopher.

Appearing before the House International Relations Committee, Baker welcomed the ascendancy of Republicans then quickly warned the new majority against interfering too much in administration conduct of foreign policy.

The former secretary of state disagreed with calls — widely

supported by Republicans for unilateral lifting of U.S. arms embargo against Bosnia and for the use of U.S. air power on the side of the Bosnian government.

He also said that if Israel and Syria ask for U.S. troops to help police a peace agreement they ought to get them — a position with more support in the administration than in Congress.

Like the Clinton administration, he walked a delicate line between condemning the loss of life in Chechnya and supporting Russia's right to maintain its territorial integrity.

X-ray blast may show black hole eating star

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — A stellar object that erupted last summer with powerful bursts of X-rays may be a black hole in the act of gobbling up a star, astronomers say.

The object, 10,000 light-years from Earth, was discovered in July when it exploded with flashes of the most powerful natural X-rays in space. The radiation was detected by NASA's Compton Gamma Ray Observatory.

NASA astronomer Colleen Wilson said Thursday that it's believed that the object may be the more massive of two stars in close orbit. The larger star, she said, may have collapsed into a very compact object that is ripping away material from its companion star.

Geologic stress under L.A. could bring larger quakes

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Stress is building under Los Angeles for earthquakes that could be far more damaging than last year's devastating jolt and even more destructive than the feared Big One, researchers said Thursday.

Another study found that such quakes directly under Los Angeles could bring down 20-story buildings that meet current codes.

Researchers led by earthquake geologist James F. Dolan said in this week's issue of the journal Science that there haven't been enough quakes to relieve the strain from the huge Pacific and North American plates squeezing past each other. His is one of three quake studies in Science.

"We think it's likely these faults could produce very large earthquakes, something that we've never seen in the historic record," Dolan said.

"When you look at geologically similar regions around the world, historically many of them have produced earthquakes in the 7.5 range from faults that look just like the faults beneath Los Angeles."

According to his calculations, a 7.2- to 7.6-magnitude quake in the Los Angeles area is likely to hit about every 140 years, compared with 100-year years between catastrophic Big Ones on the San Andreas fault. But Los Angeles hasn't experienced a quake above magnitude 7 since record-keeping began in the 1780s.

The Big One is defined as a quake of magnitude 8 on the San Andreas fault, which is 30 miles from downtown Los Angeles.

Last year's magnitude-6.7 quake 25 miles from the downtown area left 61 people dead, injured thousands and caused \$20 billion in damage.

Dolan said the magnitude 7 quakes could be much more destructive than the Big One because the faults in which they would occur are directly beneath greater Los Angeles.

Dolan suggested that there should have been 17 quakes since 1800 the size of last year's temblor to release the stress of moving plates. But there have been only two: the one last year and another in San Fernando in 1971.

In an accompanying study, seismologist Sue Hough of the U.S. Geological Survey in Pasadena presented a mathematical model of likely future quakes: 30 percent would be the size of last year's quake, and 70 percent would be larger.

In the third study, USGS seismologist Thomas Heaton said the city wasn't prepared for earthquakes larger than magnitude 7.

Nation Senator wants energy review

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Senate committee will move quickly on a broad review of national energy policies including the repeal of a ban on exporting Alaska oil, the panel's new chairman said Thursday.

But Sen. Frank Murkowski, R-Alaska, rejected suggestions that the Energy Department might be disinterested, as some Republicans have suggested, saying "it's far too early to discuss demolishing the ... department."

Murkowski, who is expected to bring a pro-development philosophy to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee, promised a review that "looks at all aspects of domestic oil and gas (development) relative to alternative renewable sources."

The Alaska senator has been one of Congress' most vocal supporters of opening the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge in far northeastern Alaska to oil drilling. The energy review is widely seen as a forerunner for pushing legislation to allow such drilling.

"We're going to look at every aspect of (energy) resource development, including ANWR," said Murkowski at a news conference.

Murkowski said repealing the ban on exports of Alaska oil is among his top priorities. The Clinton administration has also indicated that it would support such a move, but has not formally proposed an end to the ban because of concern over how it would affect trade agreements involving the shipment of Alaska oil.

Alaska officials have urged an end to the ban, which was part of the agreement that created the Alaska oil pipeline. Lawmakers at the time wanted to assure that the North Slope oil was for domestic use.

But Murkowski said the export ban is costing the United States 25,000 jobs and \$180 million a year in federal revenue, plus additional millions for Alaska. Alaska oil is sent to West Coast refineries or east through the Panama Canal, an expensive route.

On other matters, Murkowski, in his first news conference since taking over the Senate's panel that deals with energy and public lands issues, said:

"It is time to examine a variety of approaches to dealing with high-level nuclear wastes, including the possibility of entering into agreements with other nations to reprocess wastes. The Clinton administration has opposed reprocessing, arguing it would add to nuclear proliferation risks."

He plans hearings into the mounting maintenance costs at national parks and has not ruled out consideration of turning some parks over to private entities as has been discussed by some House Republicans.

The committee plans hearings next week on the U.S. agreement with North Korea to supply that country with two light-water reactors and more than 500,000 tons of petroleum. The reactors would replace those capable of producing material that could be used in nuclear weapons.

He said Congress is expected to support the agreement, but he wants the hearing because "there are a lot of unknown questions."

Murkowski also said the committee intends to examine a broad range of public-lands issues including implementation of federal forest management restrictions, the impact of the Endangered Species Act, nuclear waste cleanup at federal weapons facilities, and whether the 1872 mining law should be revised.

N.C. man drives on bomb range

FORT BRAGG, N.C. (AP) — A civilian who got his truck stuck on a Fort Bragg bombing range was lucky to get out at all. The truck won't get out at all. It will become another target.

Soldiers were about to open fire when Glen Woodcock, 31, drove his Ford Bronco into the middle of the range Monday night, then walked out when the four-wheel-drive vehicle got stuck, officials said. The range is littered with thousands of rounds of unexploded ammunition.

Woodcock was arrested by military police after he approached some soldiers and asked for help moving his truck. He was charged with trespassing and told that his truck was irretrievable.

Col. Woodrow Wilson, Fort Bragg's garrison commander, said the range is pockmarked with bomb craters and is clearly marked.

"Why or how he did not step on something and blow himself totally up is a miracle," Wilson said.

### Giving officials the hook is start for new Fish and Game

As expected, Gov. Phil Batt served notice this week on the Idaho Fish and Game Commission that unless it changes direction, he'll change its membership.

He asked for the pro-forma resignations of all six members of the commission and hinted that he might accept them.

That was a welcome step, in our view; perhaps more than any other state agency except the Department of Education, the Fish and Game Department needs some fresh air.

Fish and Game is a professionally run department that has simply lost touch with its constituency. For a state agency whose job is one part regulation and two parts service, that's a fatal flaw.

In part, Fish and Game's trouble is that Idaho isn't what it used to be. As the state has grown, that growth has affected the lifestyle of people who still live five minutes from a cornfield and 10 minutes from a trout stream.

There are no pheasants in that cornfield anymore, and fewer trout in that stream than there used to be. And unless the department goes into the game-farm business, it can't do much to bring them back.

But the perception has grown over the years that Fish and Game does things its own way, and that its well-publicized efforts to solicit the views of sportsmen and sportswomen don't have much to do with the game-management decisions the agency makes.

That may or may not be true, but it's beyond dispute that the department has a big public relations problem.

Much of that problem stems from its strong-minded director, Jerry Conley.

Conley is a better game manager than politician, and his views on big-game harvest, winter feeding, anadromous fisheries and the use of proceeds from license fees have made him a lightning rod for hunters and fishermen from Rogerson to Sandpoint.

He has presided over the adoption of

scientific game-management practices that are widely used in other states, but if he has vision for his department, he has done a poor job of articulating it.

Conley's trouble is not so much what he does as how he communicates with hunters and fishermen. Batt says Conley has lost so much credibility with those who deal with his agency that it's time he moved on. The governor is probably right.

But even if Conley goes, many of those hunters and fishermen are going to have to come to grips with the simple truth that no Fish and Game boss can deliver deer or steelhead on demand.

This is a state with 35 percent more people and 50 percent more sportsmen than it had in 1960, and changes in habitat, water and land use have fundamentally altered the game-management equation.

If Batt changes the commission's makeup, he should be sure the new commissioners don't retreat from basically sound biological principles in their stewardship over Idaho's resources. It simply isn't practical to expect the state to return to an environment in which everything that moves is shootable or catchable.

Clearly, that's what some Idahoans yearn for, and that's part of the problem.

Fish and Game is still an agency haunted by the legacy of Claude Dallas, the trapper who murdered two game wardens in Owyhee County 15 years ago. During his trial and his subsequent escape from prison, Dallas became a hero to many Idahoans for his rugged individualism and his willingness to flout authority.

The people who work for the department were stung by that episode, and to this day there remains an atmosphere of antagonism between those who hunt and fish and those who enforce the law.

The next director must lead Fish and Game beyond that, transforming the agency from the cop on the beat into one with ideas and the ability to communicate them.

### Everyone depends on farmers

I have been reading with great interest the letters about the prospect of Micron coming to the Magic Valley. One thing I have noticed is that Bill Chisholm is the only one who has mentioned that our current economy base is agriculture. I was saddened, though, to see that even he has forgotten an important economical term — parity.

In 1951, my grandfather sold soft white winter wheat for \$2.75 a bushel, and potatoes were sold for \$6 per 100-pound bag. Today, if you look in the agricultural section of this newspaper, you will find that, currently, soft white winter wheat sells for around \$3.65, and you're lucky to get a potato contract for \$5 per 100-pound bag. Granted, the price of wheat is \$1 higher, but last year, the price of wheat was a mere \$2.50 per bushel. Now go to your local implement dealer and find out that a new tractor will set you back about \$30,000, and a new pickup will cost you about \$30,000. In 1951, this tractor cost less than \$10,000 and the pickup less than \$2,000.

The point I am trying to make is that the economy that drives this valley is stagnant. Although prices seem to be going up for the goods local farmers need to operate, the prices of the commodities they sell have not changed since the early '50s.

Like it or not, everyone who lives in this area is dependent on agriculture to make a living, whether you work for McDonald's or the farmer up the road. Finally, someone has taken the initiative to bring another economy driver here. Micron would be of great benefit to the local economy and to everyone who lives in this valley.

I realize as much as anyone else that traffic will be a bear. I drive on Blue Lakes just like you do, but let's be realistic. There are plenty of ways to fix the traffic problems if our city fathers would put their heads together and work it out. Judging from other letters to the editor, it seems to be important to point out that I was born here, graduated from Twin Falls High School, own a business, pay my taxes and am considered a young progressive person by my peers.

Just remember that the definition of a third-world entity is one that buys at retail and sells at wholesale. That is also the definition of a farmer, and that is what our economy is based on now.

### Micron 'what ifs' hurt valley

In regard to Micron and the Magic Valley, I would like to ask "what if?"

Let's say Micron decided on the Jerome site. I think it's safe to say all 20,000 people (that's the figure most used) would not live on the north side of the canyon. Let's say 10,000 came to Twin Falls County. Now Jerome has the Micron tax money and Twin Falls has 10,000 people. Can we expect three, maybe four, more schools? Bond issues for what, \$15 million to \$20 million?

The added crime will mean at least doubling the Juvenile Detention Center. Will we need an addition to the jail? Maybe a new courthouse or new courtrooms or possibly a new city hall. Certainly additions to the fire department with another station. What would be the cost of these, \$10 million to \$12 million?

Certainly, we would have to enlarge or update the sewage plant and the water system. The highway district will need more funding. Then comes the personnel, i.e., teachers, counselors, custodians, county employees, more city police and county sheriffs, more equipment, school buses, firetrucks and vehicles for all the above departments.

Could this mean a \$300 to \$500 tax increase for the average home in Twin Falls over the next three to four years? This is the estimated timetable for the project.

The same could be said for Jerome if the Twin Falls site was picked. Only it would probably be worse since they don't have the population that we have to spread the costs over.

### Debate centers on parameters

We do not want to blackout Twin Falls as a potential site for new employers. It is imperative that those opposed to Micron keep this in mind and define their opposition.

It is my opinion that we do not yet know the parameters of the Micron expansion.

The key issue to me is whether 1,000 to 2,000 or 2,500 of the potential new Micron employees already live in the Magic Valley and then how many of them are currently not in the workforce or are underemployed? We know the engineers (500-plus) will have to be brought in.

The other major unanswered question for me is where the new employees currently live or will live. Will 60 percent live in Twin Falls County or 40 percent? Will the city of Twin

Falls house 30 percent or 50 percent? If 50 percent of the potential employees do not currently live here, Micron should not choose the Magic Valley.

Hopefully, the study that has been commissioned should help answer these questions:

In the outlying small towns, there is a lot of underemployment, and those towns are dying. Micron would be a big help to the financial stress evident in these small towns. The pay scale for Micron may also entice people that are not currently in the workforce to enter the workforce. I would expect people to commute from all over the valley. This is not just a Twin Falls issue.

There is another question of how many support jobs are created and where they are created. If the Micron employees come from the entire Magic Valley, how many support jobs are created in Twin Falls, for example?

We need changes to our infrastructure whether Micron comes or not. If it builds a \$1.3 billion plant, there will be \$13 to \$15 million per year in property tax revenue besides other taxes to pay for various changes to schools, roads, etc.

It is the combination of these issues that will allow me to finalize my opinion about the impacts of Micron moving to the area. If Micron means 15,000 more residents in Twin Falls, it is too big for us. At this point in time, we are all guessing.

### Seeds of growth bring weeds

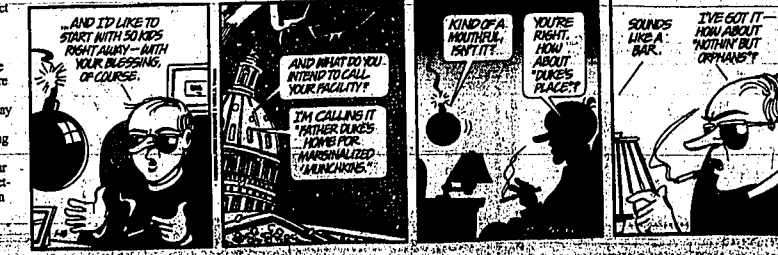

**Russia aids Israel in satellite launch**

**HAIFA, Israel** — The country that once armed Israel's enemies is now helping the Jewish state launch a satellite.

The *Gurion-1*, named after a New York philanthropist, will be launched March 28 from Russia and carried into orbit by a SS-25 ballistic missile of the type once armed with Soviet nuclear warheads.

What's more, the team of Israeli scientists completing work on the satellite in a northern Israel laboratory are mostly immigrants from the former Soviet Union.

The satellite will serve as a testing platform for 12 hi-tech Israeli firms and will also serve academic researchers. One project involves using the satellite to set up a space-based computer network for about 1,000 users.

**China will not give U.S. concessions**

**BEIJING** — China refuses to make concessions in trade talks with the United States next week even though it hopes the negotiations can avert a trade war, the government said Thursday.

Last month, the United States suspended 18 months of talks on improving China's protection of intellectual-property rights and started action to impose punitive tariffs on \$2.8 billion worth of Chinese goods.

The sanctions will take effect Feb. 4 if the two sides fail to reach a solution. China has responded with its own sanctions threat.

**Pope arrives in Manila to begin tour**

**MANILA, Philippines** — If Pope John Paul II can draw energy from his flock, he should cruise through his grueling four-nation tour after a tumultuous welcome in Asia's only Roman Catholic country.

Visibly tired when he arrived, the pope walked slowly down the stairs from the aircraft Thursday, stopping several times before reaching the tarmac, where he was handed a cane.

Seas of Filipinos stood in the broiling tropical heat for hours to greet him, erupting into shouts of "Viva II Papa!" — Long Live the Pope! — when radio stations announced his arrival. Police estimated 3.5 million people turned out to welcome the pope at the start of the 11-day trip.

Hands trembling, John Paul delivered an arrival statement in English, saying the church in the Philippines has "a special vocation" to spread Christianity among the ancient cultures of Asia.

**Niger elections produce heavy turnout**

**NIAMEY, Niger** — Turnout was heavy and balloting was peaceful Thursday despite opposition threats to disrupt parliamentary elections that critics said were rigged.

President Mahamane Ousmane dissolved the assembly in October to prevent legislators from presenting a vote of no-confidence that could have ousted him.

But turnout was heavy early Thursday, despite an icy wind blowing south from the Sahara desert. About 4.6 million voters were eligible to choose 83 legislators from a field of 774 candidates.

**Opposition leaders move toward peace**

**ALGIERS, Algeria** — Twenty-two Muslim insurgents were reported killed, supporters and critics of the government held protests, and opposition leaders agreed Thursday on proposals to end the 3-year-old civil war.

Security forces killed the militants in seven clashes in northern Algeria on Tuesday and Wednesday, the forces said in a statement.

The military-installed regime of President Liamine Zeroual says it is prepared to negotiate an end to the bloodshed, but only with groups that renounce violence. Opposition groups meeting in Rome agreed on a proposal that does not include an end to attacks.

**Women warriors defend home country**

**GROZNY, Russia (AP)** — Sazhi Aslanova opened her camouflage army jacket to reveal the grenade she had hidden inside.

"It's for me when the Russians come," she said shyly. "They won't take me alive."

Aslanova is among a handful of young women who have defied the traditional role of women in mostly Muslim Chechnya to join the Chechen forces fighting the Russian army.

"They are very brave," grunted a male fighter.

Aslanova said she does not fear the fighting. But she was no longer so sure about the independence the Chechens were fighting for as she saw more, and more people being killed and wounded.

"We're not going to need this independence if our best men are dead."

Aslanova said she joined the Chechen forces after her three brothers signed on. She could not bear to be alone at home while they risked their lives.

"My brothers were against me going to war, but I won't want to live if they die."

It is not customary for a Muslim woman to take part in fighting. Most Chechen women stay home, raising families and living under the strict control of their husbands and fathers.

But these are terrible times for her country, Aslanova said. She and her friend trained as nurses, but tending the wounded was no longer enough.

"We've reached the stage where women have to take up arms," she said.

She wore a white armband emblazoned with "Allah Akbar" — God is great — in green letters.

Her life mirrors the divisions that have torn apart Chechnya and its people. She left her husband because he was a fervent supporter of the pro-Russian opposition that does not want independence.

Their only child, a 5-year-old boy, is still with her husband.

"My husband will get his punishment in the afterlife," she said, a scowl briefly replacing her gentle smile.

**Russian artillery blasts Grozny; rebels retreat**

**GROZNY, Russia (AP)** — Russian forces bombarded the capital of Chechnya Thursday with their fiercest attack yet, showering the disintegrating city with waves of artillery and rockets as rebel resistance neared collapse.

Demoralized bands of haggard Chechen fighters resisted the ferocious new onslaught. Incoming Russian troops vowed to take the capital and end the month-long fighting in the secessionist republic.

Rebels retreated house by house from Russian forces closing relentlessly on the battered presidential palace in the city's heart. Russian helicopters sounded overhead for the first time.

Plumes of black smoke spiraled hundreds of feet over the city while shells slammed into buildings. Machine-gun and small-arms fire echoed as Moscow's troops attacked from three directions.

Chechen fighters, who had talked in recent days of defeating the Russian army, were visibly worried and exhausted. Large units had dwindled to a few men, and some groups were seen moving out of the city.

Among the latest refugees were members of President Dzhokhar

Dudayev's government, who continued to arrive in neighboring Ingushetia, the Russian government press service said.

They planned to fly abroad, it said.

Dudayev's whereabouts were not immediately clear.

Russian troops poured into Chechnya, a mostly Muslim republic of 1.2 million in the Caucasus Mountain, on Dec. 11 to crush its independence movement. They encountered fierce resistance, but Chechen zeal has flagged this week.

Rebel officers claimed Thursday that their forces retained the palace, but they acknowledged the fight was not going well. Associated Press correspondents got to within about 500 yards of the devastated building, but furious shelling kept them from seeing who held it.

Rebels were short of ammunition.

Several men in their 60s, armed with pistols and daggers, helped fill positions.

Hundreds of Russian tanks, armored personnel carriers and troop trucks were moving on several roads toward Grozny. In villages along the route, Chechens tried desperately to organize defense units but had only rifles and no heavy weapons.

Some Russian soldiers who would not give their names said they would take Grozny with the latest offensive.

Russia clearly has interpreted as a sign of weakness Dudayev's admission that his fighters could not defeat the Russian army. On Wednesday, the war's one-month mark, Dudayev said he was ready for peace talks.

Overnight, the Russian air force dropped dozens of bombs on

Grozny, which was nearly deserted Thursday except for small bands of rebel soldiers. Dazed dogs wandered through the rubble.

A bewildered woman, tears streaming down her face, wandered down a main thoroughfare as shells exploded nearby. "Jesus, what are they doing to us?" she asked. "They are not human."

On Thursday night, a shell apparently set fire to a natural-gas pipeline in an outlying neighborhood. The Interfax news agency said a fountain of flames as high as 10 feet was leaping from the ruptured line.

Thousands of people are believed to have been killed in the war, although casualty estimates vary widely.

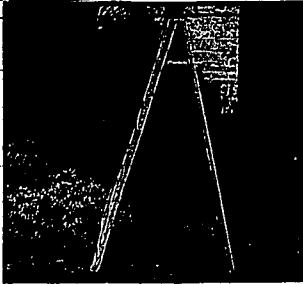

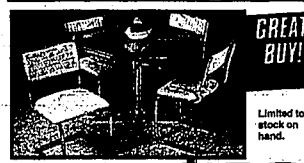

In December, the subcommittee heard a proposal from Brim Healthcare that included several options for management of the medical center or outright acquisition.

While Brim's proposal has been put on hold until the St. Luke's proposal has been presented, Carrington said the medical center will weigh all options before arriving at any decisions.

### Crapo earns spots on House commerce, agriculture panels

**TWIN FALLS**—U.S. Rep. Michael Crapo will serve on the House Commerce Committee and the House Agricultural Committee for the 104th Congress.

Crapo will also serve on the Commerce, Trade and Hazardous Materials, the Energy and Power, and the Oversight and Investigation Sub-Committees.

Jurisdiction includes national energy policy, nuclear energy and waste, energy regulation, interstate- and foreign-commerce, consumer protection, tourism and travel regulation, Superfund reauthorization, the Safe Drinking Water Act, pesticide regulation, and agency oversight.

The House Agricultural Committee will oversee the 1995 Farm Bill. His subcommittee assignment is Resource Conservation, Research, and Forestry, which includes jurisdiction for water, soil and natural resource conservation programs, small watershed program, research, agricultural credit, rural development, forestry, and energy matters.

### Commission drops regulation of one motor carrier category

**TWIN FALLS**—In response to a newly enacted federal law, the Idaho Public Utilities Commission has suspended its regulation of prices, routes or services of motor carriers that transport property in Idaho.

The state still retains regulatory authority over motor-carrier insurance, safety, registration, size and weight, and over the rates and routes for passenger service and hazardous materials carriers.

The commission also suspended most parts of Uniform Mobile Home Tariff No. 104-A, which spells out requirements for mobile home movers.

## Wolf plan runs afoul of states' righters

**BOISE**—When Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, and Rep. Golden Linford, R-Rexburg, called their natural resources committees into action Monday, they were hoping to see swift approval of a state wolf-management plan.

Instead, they collided with vocal states rights advocates in the Legislature and representatives of mining, farming, ranching, and hunting.

So far, their management plan is going nowhere.

"I guess we're a little surprised that we got such an outcry," Linford said Thursday. The chairman of the House Natural Resources and Environment Committee said the plan's supporters may have been naive—and misread the mood in the Legislature.

With the reintroduction of wolves in Central Idaho imminent, U.S. Fish and

Wildlife Service employees told Idaho it would cooperate—or they'd send the wolves anyway, and turn monitoring responsibilities over to the federal government or the Nez Perce Indian tribe.

Neither Linford nor Noh are wolf-lovers, but they're pragmatic. They'd rather work with state employees than tribal leaders or federal bureaucrats.

"I'll take my chances on our Fish and Game over the Nez Perce and the feds any day," Linford said.

But so far, their own committees have refused to hop on board—and conceded the fight to Washington, D.C.

"Maybe they're more afraid of the bureaucrats than they are the wolves," Linford said. Legislators had been emboldened by the

Nov. 8 GOP landslide and by proposals to weaken the Endangered Species Act.

Instead of signing on, legislators have sent a letter to Washington, D.C. protesting the wolf release, and they've enlisted the help of Idaho's congressional delegation.

Meanwhile, the Fish and Wildlife has extended the deadline for Idaho to come up with a wolf management plan.

While the Legislature's reaction may have surprised Linford, Lt. Gov. Butch Otter said his party's ticket was "anti-feds, anti-feds, anti-feds."

"The key issue in the race was states rights, self-determination, and 'feds, keep your nose out of our business.' What you're seeing now is that we're putting campaign promises into practice. We're tak-

ing on the feds," Otter said. GOP state chairman Randy Smith said "this Legislature is more willing to stand up" than past groups—a change he attributes in part to the new GOP governor.

Batt, meanwhile, has signed the anti-wolf letter and he's indicated support for wolf opponents. But despite his states rights talk on water issues, he hasn't appeared willing to go to the mat on the wolf debate.

"I'm not a big fan of trying to reintroduce the species, but I don't anticipate filing injunctive action," Batt said Thursday.

In order to get a court injunction, Idaho would have to show that the wolf reintroduction would cause irreparable harm to the state. Batt said that's a tough thing to prove.

Noh remains hopeful that the Legislature will approve a plan. But he said there's not much time.

"As soon as the gates are open, somebody's got to go to work" monitoring the wolves, he said. He hopes that task falls to a state agency.

## Family grants conservation easement

**PICABO**—In exchange for lower taxes, a ranch family have traded away the right to develop their lands in a deal that will help protect five miles of Silver Creek.

Thursday, 77-year-old Bud Purdy, president of the Picabo Livestock Co.; and his son, Nick, signed a conservation easement with The Nature Conservancy that will protect the 3,473-acre Picabo Livestock Ranch from development.

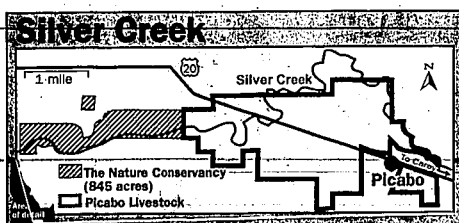
"This conservation easement is the greatest single action ever taken to preserve Silver Creek—and its wildlife," said Paul Todd, manager of The Nature Conservancy's Silver Creek Preserve.

Under Blaine County zoning, the Purdy's agricultural land could potentially be subdivided into 170 parcels. But under the easement only four building sites have been identified for future development.

"This means that our ranch will never be developed, and we're glad of it," Bud Purdy said.

Through conservation easements, landowners trade the right to subdivide their land for a tax break.

Conservancy director Guy Bonn-

ivior said in addition to lowering inheritance or income taxes, conservation easements are a powerful tool for private landowners to keep large parcels of land in one piece.

The Purdy's feared high land prices would force them or future generations to sell out, a scenario neither rancher deemed appropriate.

Nick Purdy said The Nature Conservancy's willingness to work with local ranchers was the drawing card that made them strike up this deal.

"Because our ranch encompasses such a unique environment, I wanted to work with the Conservancy to preserve it in perpetuity," Purdy said.

While the conservation easement does not give fishermen or hunters the right to cross private land, it does serve to help restore the health of the entire wetlands ecosystem.

Fred Partridge, regional fisheries manager for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, said his department supports such easements because they serve to protect the stream and re-establish stream-bank vegetation.

The increased willows and other vegetation along stream banks helps increase the fishery and helps other wildlife.

## United Way pledges surpass '93 total but fall short of goal

**TWIN FALLS**—United Way of Magic Valley volunteers aren't popping champagne corks, but they're happier than they were a year ago at this time.

The campaign officially passed the 1993 fund-raising total this week, gathering pledges of \$246,360 through Wednesday.

In its last campaign, the United Way raised \$242,445.

"We're pleased about that," United Way President Jan Rogers said. "We'll collect pledges through next Tuesday, so there's a good possibility we'll get over \$250,000."

Despite falling far short of its goal, this year's United Way campaign is already the sixth-most successful in history.

"We're disappointed that we're not going to make our goal," Rogers said. "But we had a significant improvement over last year in several areas."

The United Way of Magic Valley, which has missed its campaign goal in seven of the past 11 years, has been buffeted by a series of public-relations problems in recent years. They ranged from a 1988 embezzlement, to a controversy three years ago over donations to out-of-the-area charities, to the well-publicized revelations in 1992 about the free-spending lifestyle of former United Way of America President William Aramony.

The local United Way board has managed the keep the money flowing, though, by cutting overhead, eliminating

## Batt asks for resignations of Fish and Game panel

**BOISE**—Gov. Phil Batt has asked all members of the Idaho Fish and Game Commission to turn in their resignations, although he says he hasn't decided whether to accept them.

The move apparently is linked to Batt's efforts to replace Fish and Game Director Jerry Conley. The Fish-and-Game director is appointed by a six-person commission headed by the governor.

"I do want to have that option," the governor said, in letters that went out Tuesday.

Commissioner Wes Rose of Jerome couldn't be reached for comment Thursday.

But at least one commissioner says he won't bow to Batt's pressure to get rid of Conley.

"I would not vote for that," said Commissioner Norm Guth, a Salmon outfitter and guide. "That would not be in the best interest of the wildlife resources of this state."

Conley's office said he wasn't making public comments about the situation.

In his budget message on Wednesday, the new Republican governor lashed out at the Fish and Game Department, saying, "we must get this department back in touch with the average citizen of the state of Idaho."

Attacks on the commission, department and Conley have become commonplace in recent years.

But Guth said it was nothing unusual. "I've been involved in fish and game matters for 50 years in Idaho."

## Nevada man catches virus from rodents

**JACKPOT**—Every year as the weather got colder, ranch hand Ronnie Dudley would notice more and more rodent nests in the haystacks he used to feed livestock.

But after a bout last month with hantavirus—an often deadly virus that can cause respiratory illness—Dudley said he will no longer ignore evidence of rodents or handle nests and droppings as he works on a Nevada ranch 25 miles south of Jackpot.

"It was just basically like the flu; and it just kept getting worse, and it just got to where I couldn't breathe," said Dudley, who was in Magic Valley Regional Medical Center in Twin Falls for 10 days. "Most of it I don't even remember."

The last case of hantavirus in Idaho was reported last October in a Weiser man, a farm hand who also survived the disease, said Dr. Jesse Greenblatt, state epidemiologist with the Idaho Bureau of Disease Prevention in Boise.

There have been no hantavirus cases reported in the Magic Valley, Greenblatt said, but "I would expect that eventually you would have one there." Idaho has had seven reported cases of hantavirus with five fatalities; he said.

The chances of surviving hantavirus, a disease first reported in the United States after a spring-1993 outbreak in the Southwest, have increased to between 50 and 60 percent, Greenblatt said. Early treatment has helped save more people infected with the virus, and an increased awareness has prevented its spread, Greenblatt said.

Wild rodents, such as deer mice, are the main carriers of hantavirus, which is spread through the urine, saliva, droppings and nesting materials of infected rodents. People can get hantavirus by handling rodent debris or by inhaling stirred-up particles.

Although hantavirus is a rare disease, people should take precautions when handling rodent nests, droppings or carcasses, Greenblatt said. While wearing rubber gloves, a disinfecting solution should be sprayed on rodent debris until it is saturated, and then the debris should be double plastic-bagged and thrown out.

Symptoms of hantavirus include high fever, muscle aches, cough and headache; after a few days, respiratory symptoms worsen rapidly and lungs fill with fluid.

Dudley said a doctor first thought he had pneumonia; and he stayed with relatives in Buhl because he was advised to remain close by. It took 10 days for tests to show he had hantavirus, said Dudley, who has been working for Conley's office since he was discharged.

"The doctor said it will take a month or two for my lungs to get back to normal," said Dudley, who was given oxygen while hospitalized.

Pamphlets about hantavirus are available at local offices of the South Central District Health Department.

# EPA releases method to test waste facility standards

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has released the method it proposes to use in certifying whether the federal government's radioactive waste repository near Carlsbad, N.M., complies with environmental standards.

The U.S. Department of Energy must prove the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant can meet the standards before it buries plutonium-contaminated

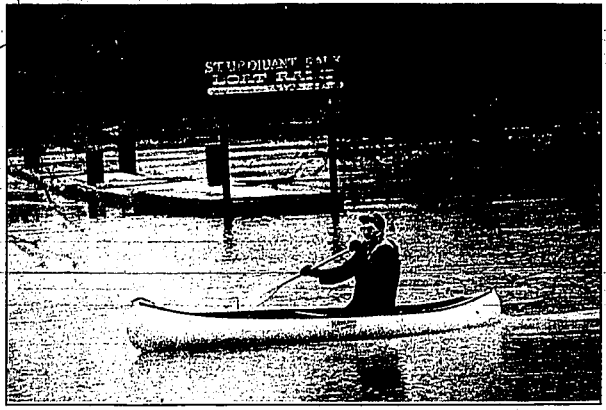
waste from the in the repository. WIPP is designed to bury radioactive waste from the nation's defense industry 2,150 feet underground in ancient salt beds southeast of Carlsbad. Plans now call for it to open in 1998 pending certification by the EPA.

The EPA in December 1993 issued final waste disposal standards for WIPP. The criteria released Thursday lay out how the DOE will make calculations to see if it meets those standards.

Larry Weinstein, acting director of the criteria and standards division in the EPA's Office of Radiation and Indoor Air, said Thursday.

The standards require "a reasonable expectation" that for 10,000 years, WIPP will prevent human radiation doses from exceeding the equivalent of about two chest X-rays per year and that any ground water contamination would not exceed levels allowed under the Safe Drinking Water Act.

Authorities declined to say how he died or what type of wounds he received. Lt. Bob Gauthier of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department said the case is still under investigation.

The terms of Guth and Lou Racine of Pocatello, who have served 12 years each, end in April and Batt plans to replace them. There have been hints from the administration that if the newly constituted commission failed to replace Conley, Batts would begin firing the remaining commissioners until that was accomplished.

"I will take steps to diminish

the interest of the department in regulating the everyday lives of Idahoans, and ask them to concentrate more on furnishing fishing and hunting opportunities for the man or woman who buys a license," Batt said in his budget message.

Guth said he's leaving Idaho. He said he's in the fishing business. "Right now, the future for anadromous fish looks a little bleak. I'm going to Alaska," he said.

Continued from B1 With more nesting cover, water fowl, song birds, small fur bearing animals and some larger animals can take advantage of the area, Partridge said.

To re-establish the water quality in Silver Creek, Bud and Nick Purdy, working with the Conservancy, have fenced three miles of sensitive stream banks from grazing cattle and will keep a watchful eye on other portions, Todd said.

In addition, young willows have been planted around the stream banks at the Kilpatrick Bridge.

The Purdys are not the first to grant easements to The Nature Conservancy.

John Fell Stevenson began the effort in 1983 with a 200-acre easement. The Purdy's have become the 11th family in the Silver Creek Valley to grant easements totalling 9,466 acres and more 30 miles of stream banks in the Silver Creek Valley.

"In a time when the conflict between conservationists and ranchers seems to be an everyday occurrence, here's a win-win example of how both groups and wildlife habitat can benefit, Bonaviver said.

Harper will serve on the Jail Committee, the Fair Board, the Weed Advisory Commission, the Historical

Society and Parks and Recreation.

Stevenson will serve on the Landfill Commission, as an advisory member of the senior citizens center and on the Minidoka Memorial Hospital Board.

Harper suggested the commissioners give reports on what is being accomplished by various boards they serve on. They decided to allot some time at each meeting for these reports.

In other business, Minidoka County Sheriff Paul Eries asked the commission for money to replace vehicles with more than 100,000 miles. The commissioners asked him to get prices on a used vehicle, as well as approving the purchase of two new vehicles.

In the afternoon session, commissioners discussed expansion of Heyburn's impact area with city representatives. They eyed the possibility of cities and the county working together.

"Each jurisdiction should have individual areas but working as a unit could cut costs for all," said Paul Aston, head of the building and zoning department. The group decided to have an engineering firm representative at the next meeting to help with planning.

Diane Schaeffer was chosen as chairwoman of the Fair Board with Noel England as vice chair. Melvin Barendregt and Nick Darrington also will serve on the Fair Board.

## Magistrate rules man charged in Smith's robbery will go to trial

BURLEY — A man charged with robbing Smith's Food King of \$49,000 at gunpoint will face trial in 5th District Court, Magistrate Judge Nathan W. Higer ruled Thursday.

Lonnice Ray Wiseman, 26, is accused of robbing the grocery store at 2 a.m. Aug. 19 on East Main Street in Burley.

Smith's Twin Falls manager Sam K. Wormsbaker, who was working in Burley during August, testified in a hearing Thursday that Wiseman held a gun to his chest and ordered him to fill a Smith's grocery sack with money.

"He handed me a bag and told me to put money in the bag," Wormsbaker said.

Wormsbaker said he had been counting money in the safe when a man approached the Courtesy Counter and asked to

cash a check. Wormsbaker said the man pulled out a gun as he approached to look at the check.

"At that time I believed it was a Hispanic male, but I know that it was him," Wormsbaker said about Wiseman.

Defense attorney Stan Holloway questioned how Wormsbaker, who told police the night of the robbery the suspect was Hispanic; could be sure that it was Wiseman who robbed the store. Wiseman is white, Holloway said.

Cassia County Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Howard Smyser said that Wormsbaker testified that he sees Hispanic features in Wiseman.

"He's been in jail. Who knows if he lost his tan or not," Smyser said.

Judge Higer said robbery convictions can earn between five years and a life-time sentence. The enhanced charge for using a gun during the robbery can add

an extra 15 years to the sentence, Higer said.

Wiseman also has been under investigation in Minidoka County for holding up employees of Swensen's Food and Drug in Paul on Aug. 8, *The Times-News* reported in September.

Mini-Cassia Criminal Justice Center Sgt. LaMar Hurst said Wiseman was sentenced to 60 days in Bannock County for eluding a police officer and has been under investigation in the states of Utah, Kentucky, Indiana and Ohio.

In most of those cases, Wiseman has been a suspect in armed robberies and others have involved assaults on police officers, Hurst said.

"Wiseman was sentenced to 25 years in Ohio's state penitentiary and served eight. He was paroled last spring. Ohio has issued a warrant for his arrest on a parole violation, Hurst said.

## Colorado senator proposes grazing fee with 25% hike

GREELEY, Colo. (AP) — Sen. Ben Nighthorse Campbell has stepped up with a new grazing fee proposal that would boost the cost to ranchers by 25 percent.

The Colorado Democrat's proposal would tie the federal fee to

costs charged for grazing on private lands. But that figure would be adjusted to account for differences between grazing costs and conditions on public and private land.

Under the proposal, the federal fee would increase from \$1.86 per

animal unit month to \$2.33 in the first year. An animal unit month is the amount of forage consumed by a cow and a calf in one month.

"I believe that it is fair for everybody," Campbell said in a statement released Wednesday.

## Utah won't bend on law

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Gov. Mike Leavitt says Utah will not cave in to threats of another abortion lawsuit.

The same law center that has sued Utah over abortion in the past is threatening a suit over the state's refusal to use Medicaid funds to pay for abortions of victims of rape or incest.

"We have a Utah state law that is in conflict with a regulation from a middle-level manager (in federal Health and Human Services), and I have a responsibility to support the Utah law," Leavitt said. Utah law prohibits the use of taxpayers' funds for any abortions.

## Universities' squabble harmful, official says

MOSCOW (AP) — The chairman of the University of Idaho electrical engineering department is asking alumni to take a stand in the debate over engineering education.

The state Board of Education, when it meets Jan. 26 in Boise, will consider Boise State University's bid for its own engineering school. That would pit the two universities against each other in a self-destructive competition for scarce state dollars, according to David Egoif, University of Idaho electrical engineering chairman.

"The end result will be mediocrity," both at Boise and Moscow, he said.

Egoif has mailed letters to about 800 of the department's graduates urging them to lobby

state board members and legislators prior to the January meeting.

Joe Parkinson, State Board of Education member and former chief executive of Boise-based Micron Technology, started the engineering debate last year when he criticized engineering education in southern Idaho. The state's Boise engineering program is a joint effort, with Boise State teaching lower-division courses and Idaho offering upper-division classes and granting degrees.

Parkinson's resignation from Micron in September was followed by an offer from the company to donate \$6 million to the state for engineering education, provided \$5 million is spent to establish a Boise State engineering college.

Boise State made its own case to the state

board last month with a negative assessment of the joint engineering program. The Boise school said it could do a better job at less cost with its own program.

Idaho wants to expand the existing joint program by hiring additional faculty members and making it possible for mechanical and civil engineering majors to complete their schooling in Boise. Only electrical engineering students can do so now. Mechanical and civil engineering students must spend their final one to two years at Moscow completing degree requirements.

UI faculty and staff paid for the alumni mailing out of their own pockets, Egoif said. "The work was also done on their own time, he said."

## New World Mine faces legal challenge

WASHINGTON — When efforts to reform the 1872 mining law collapsed last year, so did environmentalists' hopes that Congress or the Clinton administration would help stop mining near Yellowstone National Park.

Reform legislation has resurfaced this year, but environmentalists say it's too late to prevent a Canadian-based company from mining gold on land three miles above the park in Montana.

So two conservation groups are taking matters into their own hands. American Rivers and Trout Unlimited said they will announce Friday details of a legal challenge to the Crown Butte New World Mine.

Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt has pointed to the New World mine and the Barrick Goldstrike mine near Elko, Nev., as examples of a how-hard-rock-mining companies can purchase federal land for less than \$5 an acre, extract minerals worth millions without paying the feds a royalty, and leave a toxic mess behind.

The New World Mine is still in the exploratory stages and has promised to clean up after digging out about \$500 million in gold and other minerals.

A Babbitt aide said the secretary still opposes the New World mine because it threatens the rivers and animals of Yellowstone. Babbitt is considering ways to halt the mining operation, the aide said.

Stephanie Hanna, a spokeswoman for Babbitt, said she had no knowledge of the environmental group's proposed legal action and would not comment on it.

However, Hanna said the secretary will tone down his stance on the mine and reform legislation. He'll be working with Sen. Frank Murkowski and Rep. Don Young, both Republicans of Alaska, who chair the panels with jurisdiction over mining, she said.

Supporters of a broad mining reform measure say the legislative battles will likely mirror those from last year when months of heated debate ended in frustration.

But they're trying again. Last week, Rep. Nick Rahall, D-W.Va., introduced a measure that calls for strict reclamation standards and an eight percent royalty on the value of

minerals taken. No cleanup or royalty payments are required now.

Rahall's bill is the same one that passed the House by a wide margin last year.

But western senators support less intrusive legislation because they fear that 40,000 hard rock mining jobs and the western way of life are at stake.

Idaho Republican Sen. Larry Craig, who represents a state with about 1,000 hard rock mining jobs, is expected to introduce a bill similar to one he pushed through the Senate last year. That bill called for a two percent royalty payment from profits.

An official at the Mineral Policy Center, which supports the stronger Rahall bill, said staffers will go door to door this week on Capitol Hill to lobby for a reform bill.

"At the very least we need to get the companies that mine on public land paying royalties," said Beverly Reece. "It's ludicrous that they pay no royalties. It's like Kellogg's making cereal but getting their corn for free."

Reece noted that coal miners and oil and gas producers have to pay federal royalties and live under environmental regulations.

Until reform is enacted, Reece said the only way to block hazardous mines is through public pressure and legal challenges.

"A mining industry-supported group has said they will be looking to the western senators to craft 'fair' legislation again this year.

"The mining industry looks forward to working closely with the new Congress, administration and western governors to craft fair legislation that will reform the mining law but also preserve western economies," said Jack Gerard, a spokesman for the Mineral Resources Alliance.

New World mine officials could not be reached for comment.

### Coal train collision kills 1, injures 3

LAS VEGAS (AP) — One crewman was killed and three injured before dawn Thursday when two Union Pacific Railroad coal trains collided head-on 11 miles northeast of here.

Six locomotives and 18 coal cars derailed, according to John Bromley, a Union Pacific spokesman in Omaha, Neb. The accident, at 3:55 a.m. MST, closed the railroad's main line between Salt Lake City and Los Angeles, Bromley said.

The accident occurred at a siding 23 miles east of Caliente, near the Nevada-Utah border.

"One of the trains was to stop at the Acorns siding and let the other train go by," Bromley said. "One of the trains went by the signal that would have stopped him."

### Phone bill probe targets Florida company

COEUR D'ALENE — Attorney General Al Lance has launched an investigation into a Florida firm being accused by Panhandle residents of sending them bogus bill for pay-per-minute telephone calls to a phone sex line.

But the company, North Star Communication, contends it is the customers in Coeur d'Alene's 772 telephone exchange who are trying to pull off a scam.

The state inquiry, however, began only after a number of GTE customers reported being billed large amounts of money for late night and early morning telephone calls to "Live One-on-One."

### EPA takes control of mine-site cleanup

KELLOGG — The federal government has ousted Gulf USA Corp. from control of the cleanup at the Bunker Hill Superfund site, because the corporation has no money.

Local residents say they're happy the cleanup project is proceeding, but less excited that there will be no local control.

Gulf is expected to fight a move by the Environmental Protection Agency to take over the offices of Pintlar Corp., the company's Kellogg facility. For five years, Pintlar's local employees have managed much of the lead removal at Bunker Hill, with EPA oversight.

### Ada County considers driving citations

BOISE — Ada County drivers cited for multiple driving violations recently could be in for a big break.

Ada County Prosecutor Greg Bower says his office might have to dismiss numerous charges of driving-related infractions following a 4th District judge's ruling.

The Dec. 23 ruling by Judge Alan Schwartzman declared that a woman cited for driving without privileges, failing to carry proof of insurance and speeding could not be charged with all three violations at the same time.

Schwartzman based his decision on an Idaho Supreme Court decision this summer in which the court ruled that a woman charged with driving under the influence could not be charged at the same time with a minor traffic violation.

### Meridian businesses show city growing

MERIDIAN — More houses, restaurants, banks and stores every month are evidence that Meridian is still Idaho's fastest-growing city.

Now with an estimated 15,500 people, it is the next logical step because more people need more services.

"When people are there to be served, then commercial people come in and develop," said Jim Johnson, the chairman of the Meridian Planning and Zoning Commission.

During the past six months, the city has issued about 20 permits for assorted shops, restaurants, banks and other service-related businesses. That is almost as many permits as were issued during all of fiscal 1994, and almost 1/2 times the number issued during fiscal 1993.

### Suspect in boy's death reported missing

DENVER — A drifter arrested in the murder of a 4-year-old Idaho boy at a Denver truck stop had been reported missing by his family in Mexico, authorities said.

Alfredo Diaz-Vega, 26, is one of two suspects in the death of Tyson Blazing. Diaz-Vega was hitchhiking in New Mexico when he got a ride with trucker Neil Schenk, 25, of Honeshoe Bend, Idaho, who was traveling with the boy. The boy's mother, Candy Bahr, said she gave permission for Schenk, her roommate and friend, to take the boy on the road with him.

Diaz-Vega's family said they last saw him Jan. 3 at his father's home in Juarez, Mexico. Relatives told police that he is a loner but has never been in trouble. Police said Diaz-Vega is a legal immigrant with no criminal record.

## Some abuse allegations against O.J. withdrawn

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Prosecutors Thursday withdrew some of the most explosive domestic-violence allegations against O.J. Simpson, including a claim that he threatened to cut off the heads of his ex-wife's boyfriends.

In all, prosecutors withdrew without explanation 18 of the 62 incidents they have outlined in court papers released Wednesday and during a hearing on whether to "admit" evidence that Simpson beat his ex-wife.

"By crossing these out we're not commenting on the truth of these incidents or the untruth of them or the credibility of any of the witnesses," Deputy District Attorney Lydia Bodin said. The prosecutors reserved the right to try to introduce the material at trial.

Defense attorneys denounced the tactic of introducing and then retracting the allegations as an outrageous attempt to manipulate public opinion.

"Perhaps they're trying to get at a second jury pool in case there's a hung jury," Simpson lawyer Robert Shapiro said.

The documents, including entries from Nicole Brown Simpson's diary and letters Simpson wrote her, portrayed Simpson as a fiercely jealous man who beat and stalked his ex-wife. The defense contends such information is irrelevant and shouldn't be presented to jurors.

## Report points to arson in Seattle warehouse fire

SEATTLE (AP) — A massive warehouse fire that killed four Seattle firefighters was deliberately set in the building's basement, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer reported Thursday.

Signs of arson include peculiar burn patterns and the more thorough destruction of debris found near the fire's point of origin, sources told the newspaper.

"The area is more catastrophic; it has more of a burn area than a Seattle public safety source, who asked that his name not be used, told the newspaper.

The signs around a 20-foot-diameter circle in the west end of the building indicate that an accelerant — or flammable liquid — was used, the newspaper said.

KIRO Television reported earlier this week that two sources familiar with the investigation had confirmed the fire was arson.

Investigators publicly have only described last Thursday

night's fire as "suspicious."

"We will not release any information with regard to the cause or origin until we are absolutely finished out here on the scene, and we are not yet," Jim Provencher, spokesman for the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, said this morning.

He said a determination on the cause could come later today.

"We do have ideas of where and how it started," agent Mark Logan, head of the ATF arson team, said Wednesday.

A memorial Wednesday for the four victims was attended by several thousand firefighters and citizens who lined the streets as a procession of mourners gathered at Seattle Center.

The five-alarm fire destroyed the warehouse near the International District that housed Mary Pang Food Products Inc. as well as a bakery and rehearsal space for a rock band.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Mormon Church President Howard W. Hunter was in fair condition Thursday after being hospitalized for unspecified tests and evaluation.

LDS Hospital spokesman Jess Gomez confirmed the 86-year-old Hunter had been admitted Thursday morning, but he could not release further details.

Hunter, the second-oldest man ever to become president of the Mormon Church, became the 14th "prophet, seer and revelator" of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on June 5 following the death of his predecessor, former U.S. agriculture secretary Ezra Taft Benson.

Hunter's last public appearance was over the weekend when he offered dedicatory prayer for the new Bountiful Temple.

## KKK cancels Denver rally

DENVER (AP) — The Ku Klux Klan has canceled its annual rally in Denver to protest Martin Luther King Day.

Shawn Slater, who heads the local Klan chapter, has withdrawn his permit to rally Saturday on the west steps of the state Capitol, authorities said.

Slater did not tell police why he was cancelling the rally, but detective Tom Fisher, who works in the Denver police intelligence unit, said lack of interest appeared to be a factor.

"Four years ago, there were major problems," Fisher said. "They had over 110 participants. Three years ago there were 45 or 50, last year 22 and this year there's none."

A rally by a separate Klan faction is scheduled for Saturday in Boulder.

## 'Little Buddha' opens Foreign Film Festival

TWIN FALLS — As a prescription for never-ending winter, the Magic Valley Arts Council recommends an imported remedy: The group's seventh annual Foreign Film Festival starts Wednesday.

"People in the Twin Falls area might feel culturally isolated from most of the world," said Pat Marcantonio, a Jerome

weekly newspaper editor and a member of the arts council's Foreign Film Council. "The film festival is a way for culture from other countries to come to them."

This year's lineup includes Bernardo Bertolucci's *"Little Buddha,"* Lina Wertmuller's *"Ciao, Professore!"*, Ang Lee's *"Eat Drink Man Woman,"* Whit Stillman's *"Barcelona"* and Stephen Elliott's *"Priscilla: Queen of the Desert."* The goal was to bring movies to

Twin Falls that could only be seen in a movie theater, said Fran Frost, director of the arts council. All but one of the five movies on the showbill aren't out on video.

The growing local market for high-quality films makes it possible for local theaters to book more foreign films, according to Larry Roper, president of Interstate Amusement.

"Gramercy Pictures, who released *"Four Weddings and a Funeral,"* is now

asking for screens in Twin Falls," he said.

"Generally, people who attend the festival share this interest," said Jeff Fox, who teaches English at the College of Southern Idaho and is a member of the film council. "They like to go, and they like to talk about what they see."

The festival begins on Wednesday with a look into Asian Buddhist culture.

# Bob, Bob, Bobbing along,

## Frenetically combustible a cappella group plays CSI Sunday

"You say I have everything

TWIN FALLS — Recipe for entertainment:  
• Two cups of music  
• One cup of comedy  
• Two sprinkles of "bobbing" around on stage.

Blend well.  
What's the product? The Bobs.

This California-based a cappella quartet, also known as Richard "Bob" Greene, Janie "Bob" Scott, Matthew "Bob" Stull and Joe "Bob" Finetti, will hit the Magic Valley turning (sorry, bobbing) on Sunday.

That's lots of Bob.  
The Bobs idea originated because group members are loyal viewers of the *"Minister Dog Show"* on PBS-TV. Stull explained in a phone interview last week. The term B.O.B. means "Best of Breed" in the dog world.

Then Joe Finetti joined the group and gave its name a new twist. "Joe Bob" became a southern joke.

The group began as a "hobby" 14 years ago, Stull said, "just being able to sing for fun." Back then, the quartet was a trio: Stull, Greene and Gunnar Madsen, who is no longer with the group.

Scott and Finetti happened along later, making the Bobs a quintet for a while. With the loss of Madsen, it was quartet Bobs again.

"We sing every style we can think of," Stull said. "We are not held by any particular style."

Tunes ranging from gospel to blues to rock to jazz pack the Bobs' albums and shows with lots of one-two rhythmic punches.

"The Bobs sing like (Gary) Larson draws," The Seattle Times reported. Stull said the group could loosely be compared to the Manhattan Transfer, with more of a rock-n-roll, storyline-driven message. Consider the Transfer's "Birdland" versus the Bobs' arrangement of Jimi Hendrix's "Purple Haze." Think of the Manhattan Transfer with a wacky script.

The Bobs' press release describes Greene as "the Bob with the deep voice" (he sings bass). It also lists Greene as the "Woofers: 58-477 Hz," Scott as the "Tweet-cr: 164-698 Hz," Stull as the Mid-range Horn: 130-620 Hz" and Finetti as the "Mid-range Driver: 44-45 mph."

It's a joke.

Most of the times, Stull said, the group isn't even confined to specific voice parts due to their varying ranges.

Technically, the group consists of two tenors, a baritone and a bass. Among female voices, Scott would be considered an alto.

"But she really is a tenor," Stull insisted.



The Bobs, based in the California Bay Area, add a bit of humor to their vocal performances.

Though the Bobs are known for their covers, such as the Beatles' "You Can't Do That" and Talking Heads' "Psycho Killer," 85 percent of the material is original.

The Bobs are known for injecting a bit of humor into their music, along with a generous dose of poetic license. The group's show is a place where people can "escape and get some laughs," Stull said.

The Bobs have opened for the Grateful Dead, Robert Palmer, Roy Orbison, Frank Zappa, Billy Crystal and Robin Williams. Stull said the Bobs music may be "too quirky" to be played on formatted radio stations. The group has more of a cult following with "incredibly loyal fans," he said.

Ask Richard Bob about being a matinee idol in Italy. Ask Joe Bob about singing

with Bobby McFerrin. Ask any of the Bobs about celebrities they've played with and never spoken to. No, don't.

The Bobs have been made a permanent part of the American Music Collection at the Smithsonian. In 1985, group members received a Grammy nomination for their arrangement of the Beatles' "Helter Skelter."

Such achievements were "born of hard work."

The Bobs' tours can take anywhere from a weekend to five weeks, Stull reported.

And all four Bobs do not live in one big house in Berkeley, Calif., and put cute notes to each other on the refrigerator.

"It's not glamorous," Stull said. "You become more of an airport-airline-hotel expert."

But then comes the performing, along

with "the applause," which is the best part of all, Stull has decided.

Through the years, he said, the group has become more professional, and the vocal arrangements have become more complicated.

The Bobs now distribute a press release that says, "Without the Bobs, life as we know it on this planet would cease altogether, and we would be plunged into unimaginable darkness."

What's in store for the future of a group with PR like this?

The Bobs want to create a Grimm's Fairy Tales act, Stull said.

No surprise. What else could be expected from a group that calls itself "Spontaneous Human Combustion?"

**JACKPOT** — In 1953, four bingers called the Drifters signed a contract with Atlantic Records and released a chart-topping tune titled "Money Honey." It made plenty.

The song was later recorded by Elvis Presley and used as the theme song for a television show about his life.

The Drifters also released the Irving Berlin classic, "White Christmas." It was a ballad-with-a-beat version, and it became the number five best-selling Christmas recording of all time.

On stage, each vocalist takes a turn as lead singer, crooning music that transcends the generations. The music includes "I Fall in Love" and "Rudy Blue."

The "White Christmas" recording was featured in the blockbuster movie, "Home Alone."

Pinkney's currently touring the country with his "Original Drifters Revue." The group travels in a

# Billy Ray Cyrus gains respect

## Nashville notes

**NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP)** — Billy Ray Cyrus had scored a good review, and he had the proof right in his hands.

"Well, it's such a rare change," said the man still best known for his international smash but highly ridiculed "Achy Breaky Heart" three years and two albums later. The hit took Cyrus to superstar status in a year, pushing sales of his debut album "Some Gave All" to more than 10 million.

The business this day was the promotion of his third album, "Storm in the Heartland." Cyrus, his producers and lawyer, and "Achy Breaky Heart" writer Don Von Tress were grouped around a copy of the Nashville morning newspaper.

The Tennessean's music writer had just made their day, writing:

"There's nothing as huge here as 'Achy Breaky Heart' or 'In The Heart of a Woman,' but it's a consistent, well-made album. And has anybody noticed the bashing is subsiding in many circles, in favor of empathy?"

That fits in fine with Cyrus' soundbite for the new album.

## Nashville notes

"It has what feels to me like everything that everybody should need, want and expect out of a Billy Ray Cyrus album," Cyrus said. "I don't think there's any holes."

"I think it has everything that my fans will expect, everything that radio will expect, everything that the young kids will expect."

"Well now, what might that be?"

Start with novelty sing-alongs like "ACHY BREAKY HEART" — "Deja Blue" and "Redneck Heaven." Mix in a dollop of earnest message songs about the plight of farmers ("Storm in the Heartland"), abused and runaway children ("Enough is Enough" and "Patsy Come Home") and American Indians ("Geronimo").

And just to keep us off balance, Cyrus throws in a couple of heartfelt songs that reveal a little of himself, "I Ain't Even Left" and "The Past."

"I Ain't Even Left," written by Cyrus with Corky Holbrook and Joe Scatfe, explores the singer's dilemma of having a growing family and a job that frequently takes

him far from home.

The 33-year-old Cyrus composed "The Past" in Amsterdam during a tour last year.

"I was looking over the canal and I seen a little boy over playing at a school, and all the other kids was gathered in one pile, and he was over by himself," Cyrus said.

"I looked like maybe he was the poorest of the kids, and certainly a loner. He was just kind of reminded me of myself. My life just flashed before me and I grabbed a piece of paper and wrote the song, just real fast."

"Achy Breaky Heart" is mentioned in Cyrus' new record company biography only in passing on the third page, but the singer is still proud of the part it played in the commercial explosion of country music.

He said country music also is reaping benefits from his tour in Australia two years ago, two trips to Europe and other successes in Africa.

"I know that they know regardless of what they say or what is said about Billy Ray Cyrus, that the truth is that this music opened up a lot of doors," he said.

In 1993's "Little Buddha," Bertolucci, the Italian director of "The Last Emperor," tells the story of an American boy who is believed to be a reincarnation of a Tibetan lama. With the reluctant agreement of his parents, he travels to a Far Eastern lamasery.

The scene then shifts between their home in Seattle and the mountain stronghold of the Buddhist monks. Parallel to the boy's trip, the story of Buddhism unfolds, a story 25 centuries' old about how Prince Siddhartha became Buddha, whose teachings and philosophies spawned the religion.

Singer Chris Isaak portrays the boy's father and Brigit Fonda, of "Single White Female," is the boy's mother. Keanu Reeves takes a sharp departure from his most recent role in the movie "Speed," plays Siddhartha.

"It is not only beautiful on the eye, but has a deeper message of what happens when the modern West collides with the spirituality of the East," Marcantonio said.

On Wednesday, Jan. 25, Wertmuller, another Italian moviemaker best known for "Seven Beauties," spins a story of third-grade teacher Marco Spirelli, who through a clerical error has been sent to a small town outside Naples. "Feed the body artfully, and the soul will take care of itself," wrote Time film critic Richard Schickel. "His children are not aware of that, nor can they see his meals as metaphors for love; they see them as a form of torture instead."

Chu fares better than his daughters in matters of love. Schickel says, perhaps "because cooking at his level has taught him to blend the practical, paradoxical gifts of calculation and improvisation while his children are — until they right themselves — buffeted by abstracts and distractions."

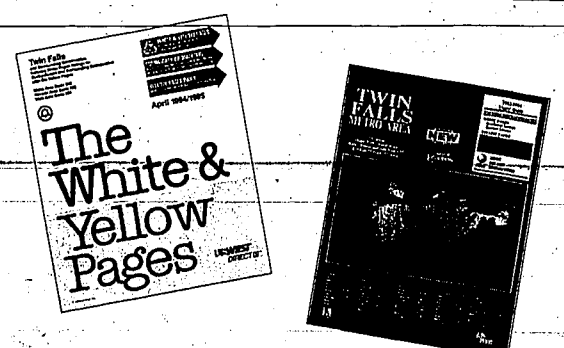

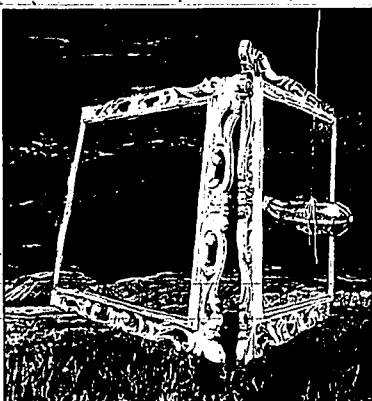

# Holy hitmakers: Christian soldiers rock onward

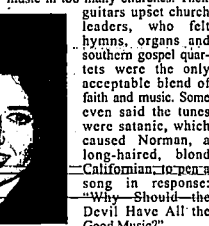
CHICAGO — The year 1969 was a watershed, marking the first moon landing, the Chicago 7 trial and Woodstock.

The counterculture was in full swing, and so was its Christian counterpart, the Jesus movement. Christian communes, coffeehouses, hippie-oriented churches and underground newspapers were springing up in abundance as an increasing number of young people distanced themselves from the search for enlightenment through drugs and eastern mysticism — embraced Christianity. The phenomenon grew so pervasive that it was eventually chronicled in a Time magazine cover story.

With that movement came something called "Jesus music." The rock and folk-rock songs sounded no different from their secular counterparts — unless you listened to the lyrics. The writers were a handful of regional ragamuffin minstrels — Larry Norman, Mike Johnson, Danny Taylor, Randy Matthews, Randy Stonehill, Paul Clark and Chuck Girard and his band Lovesong — who spoke of their born-again belief that Jesus was real and had radically changed their lives.

"We had no credentials, no ministerial degrees," says Johnson, who played a Cream song at live rock shows with his band the Eskajunks. "We were just a bunch of guys who saw something that needed to be done."

band, wherever they could find people to listen: on the street or the beach, in coffeehouses, clubs and theaters, at college campuses. Most had come from the secular music scene. Initially, they didn't play their music in too many churches. Their guitars upset church leaders, who felt hymns, organs and southern gospel quartets were the only acceptable blend of faith and music. Some even said the tunes were satanic, which caused Norman, a long-haired, blond Californian, to pen a song in response: "Why Should the Devil Have All the Good Music?"

Twenty-five years later, such concerns are passe. Contemporary Christian music has grown into a multi-billion-dollar industry, embracing every musical style from heavy metal to rap. Amy Grant has become a pop singer and a Top 40 fixture while still enjoying huge popularity in the Christian music scene that launched her career. Profit-minded conglomerates have bought up the major Christian record labels. And as Christian rock enters its second quarter-century, it's on the verge of the biggest growth surge in its history. But with that growth comes a question: Can Christian rock conquer the world without losing its soul?

"That is the central conflict," admits Steve Taylor, who first turned Christian rock on its ear in the early '80s with new-wave music and biting, satirical lyrics. "Gospel music can quite easily lose its soul — it's

If you're looking for the best that Christian rock has served up in its first 25 years, this baker's dozen is a good place to start. Some recordings are out of print, but True Tunes Records in Wheaton, Ill. (708-665-3866), may be able to help find them:

**PAUL CLARK, "SONGS FROM THE SAVIOR, VOL. 2" (1972)** — Christian rock's equivalent of Neil Young had been playing guitar for a mere two years before he tossed out this folk-rock gem, full of great solos and passionate vocals.

**LARRY NORMAN, "IN ANOTHER LAND" (1974)** — A wide-ranging, straightforward song cycle from the man who put Christian rock on the map.

**PHIL KEAGGY, "THE MASTER AND THE MUSICIAN" (1978)** — Is an instrumental album really "Christian"? Then why couldn't this laid-back guitar masterpiece ever get any airplay?

**DAVID EDWARDS, "DAVID EDWARDS" (1980)** — Mix Nick Lowe and Joe Jackson and you've got some idea of the delights on the first of Edwards' three fine albums. He's now a computer programmer in New York "with a trunk full of songs waiting to be unearthed," he says wistfully.

**ARKANGEL, "WARRIOR" (1980)** — Fans of Jethro Tull and early Rush might like this offbeat rock band with a medieval flavor. Leader Kemper Crabbs' solo album "The Vigil" is just as good.

**KEITH GREEN, "SO YOU WANNA GO BACK TO EGYPT" (1980)** — Green died in a 1982 plane crash. He left behind this warm album that features

**DAVE MARKEE BAND, "THE TRUMPET CALL" (1985)** — This Pink Floyd-ish rock opera was written by Soviet musician Valer Barinov, who was impressed for his evangelism, but not before a rough Russian tape of "Trumpet Call" was smuggled out of the country. It made its way to Markee, Eric Clapton's former-bass-player, who re-recorded a translated version.

**MARGARET BECKER, "SIMPLE HOUSE" (1990)** — Quite simply Christian rock's best female vocalist, with a sound somewhere between Kate Bush and Marian Carey.

**GLEN KASER, "ALL MY DAYS" (1993)** — The leader of Chicago's hard-rock Rez surpasses anything the band ever did in this solo album.

**STEVE TAYLOR, "Squint" (1993)** — The genre's top lyricist. "Squint" is his best yet, with a sound that echoes everything from punk to the Doors.

**HARRY GORE AND THE MEASLES, "SUBTLETY GOES OUT THE WINDOW" (1994)** — A recent indie masterpiece reminiscent of Lenny Kravitz.

Gaylor is aggressively pursuing new technologies to expand Z Music's impact while it tries to persuade cable giant TCI and other carriers to squeeze it into their packages. It recently signed a deal with Time Warner Cable, which will offer Z Music to all its cable systems.

Bob Darden, an author and editor, who wrote about the Christian music scene for Billboard for 10 years, thinks the network will make a big impact.

Z Music promises to be a godsend for Christian artists who find it difficult to get their material aired on MTV and other outlets. Michael Sweet, former lead singer of the heavy-metal band Stryper, recently abandoned his campaign to get MTV to show his video "Ain't No Safe Way," which promotes sexual abstinence before marriage. Sweet said it was a content issue. MTV alleged it was a matter of quality.

Sweet's hard rock solo debut on a Christian label already has sold more than 200,000 copies. He quit Stryper, he says, when he found the secular rock lifestyle leading him away from God. "This is a second chance for me. It's up to me not to blow it."

But the era of Z Music and Billboard charts presents another challenge, says artists. How do you reconcile the Christian ideal of sacrifice and servanthood with stardom and hype?

Steven Curtis Chapman, whose pop-country hooks and boyish good looks make him the most likely to join Amy Grant and Michael W. Smith in the mainstream arena, admits he and other musicians have a fight hard to keep their focus. "We're not here to say we have all the answers. We have a relationship with Jesus that we get hope from; and that's what gets us through another day."

**"True Lies"** (PG-13). With a reported cost of more than \$100 million, "True Lies" consists of three action pieces, the final one almost feature-length, with a bunch of silliness in between. The action is absolutely breathtaking... viewers may overlook the film's inadequacies.

### New videos

The story begins in James Bond fashion with a spectacular sequence. Arnold Schwarzenegger swims under a moat surrounding a Swiss castle, dons his scuba gear to reveal a tuxedo, joins a formal party of international dignitaries, speaking to them in their own languages. After invading an arms dealer's computer, he dances a hot tango with a seductive beauty, then makes a hurried escape, zapping a host of guards on skis and snowmobiles. He joins his two confederates in the control van, and they escape.

Next he enters the domestic scene in suburban Washington, D.C., sharing a cozy breakfast with his ward (Janis Lee Curtis) and daughter (Eliza Hestlov). We are asked to believe that for 17 years Schwarzenegger has been leading a double life, posing as a staid businessman while working for the superspy agency Omega.

Doesn't he ever return from his "business" trips bruised and slashed? How glib can a wife be? These and other elements of logic go unanswered.

The domestic matters reach a nadir when Curtis is conned into a phony spy plot by an amorous used car salesman. Her husband suspects an affair, and what follows is unconvincing to the point of embarrassment.

James Cameron, whose "Terminator 2" set a new standard for movie stunts, exceeds himself with "True Lies." The explosions are normal for the genre, but the chases and crashes, particularly along a Florida causeway and on a Miami high-rise, are awe-inspiring. It's easy to see where the money went.

By now Schwarzenegger has perfected all the moves and the sly wit that go with the action hero. Curtis bravely pursues the task of converting from mousy wife and legal secretary to ruthless commander; the role would have been a disaster in less skilled hands.

Tom Arnold is surprisingly good as Schwarzenegger's buddy, though his constant chatter becomes grating. (Video West, Blockbuster).

# Recipe for 1995: More action, comedy

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The movie menu for 1995: more of the same, maybe a little bigger. Hollywood plans to stick to the same formula that was its biggest box-office year in 1994: fast action, famous names, far-out comedy. That combination sold \$5.4 billion worth of tickets in U.S. theaters last year, a \$200 million increase over 1993's record. "Fortunately or unfortunately, 1995 will bring nothing new," predicted Bill Mechanic, president of 20th Century Fox. "Bigger being considered better, you will see a lot of films of large scale."

"The proliferating delivery systems for entertainment — cable, cassettes, etc. — are providing moviegoers the opportunity to sit at home," said Robert Shaye, chairman of New Line Cinema. "The only thing they're missing is the theatrical experience."

"So it looks like the big stuff, the exciting stuff, the fun stuff, the emotion-provoking stuff will be what captures the audience's imagination and motivates them to go to the movies. People really want to go out. They just want to get their money's worth."

You want big? How about Universal's "Waterworld," due in July? Starring Kevin Costner, it reportedly has hydroplaned past the \$135 million mark, by far the most expensive movie ever.

Last year, 10 films made at least \$100 million at the box office — eight in the summer and two in December. "The Santa Clause" and "Interview with the Vampire: The Queen of the Damned" are approaching \$300 million.

The chances for 1995 look better.

to be that nothing of importance came out until Washington's birthday. But many of the Christmas films were released at Thanksgiving, and most of them are played out."

Among the films due this month: director John Singleton's "Higher Learning"; "Murder in the First," starring Christian Slater and Kevin Bacon; "Bad Company," with Laurence Fishburne and Ellen Barkin; and "Before Sunrise," with Ethan Hawke. The new year is likely to bring more films to the marketplace. The reasons: increased prosperity for the major companies; growing importance of the so-called minors.

New Line, which now has access to Ted Turner's deep pockets, struck gold with Jim Carrey in "The Mask" and "Dumb and Dumber." The aggressive Miramax, now in the Disney fold, elicited with "Pulp Fiction."

"We may have to change our thinking about which companies are majors," commented John Krier, whose Exhibitors Relations Co. charts box-office grosses. Krier expects the number of 1995 films from the major companies to exceed last year's total of 141.

Along with "Waterworld," the big-buck projects include: "Die Hard" (with a vengeance), (again with Bruce Willis); "First Knight" (Sean Connery as King Arthur); "Richard Gere as 'Executive Decision'" (Liam Neeson as the Scottish hero); "Goldentyne" (with a new James Bond, Pierce Brosnan); "Apollo 13" (Tom Hanks and Kevin Bacon as astronauts); "Judge

Dredd" (Sylvester Stallone in futuristic action); "Batman Forever," (Val Kilmer suits for Michael Keaton); Tommy Lee Jones and Carrey supply the villainy. "Bigness can be dangerous," Mechanic cautioned. "More is not always better; 'The Santa Clause' proved that. It all comes down to story. If you have an interesting idea and you do it well, you'll succeed. If you just have effects, you'll fail."

The studios continue reworking old material. The year will bring "The Brady Bunch," "Mission: Impossible" (Tom Cruise), "Kiss of Death" (David Caruso, Nicolas Cage), "The Nutty Professor" (Eddie Murphy), "Sabrina" (Harrison Ford), "Highlander III" (Christopher Lambert) and "The Saint."

Plus two versions of Jekyll-Hyde: "Mary Reilly," with Julia Roberts and John Malkovich and "Dr. Jekyll and Ms. Hyde" starring Sean Young and Tim Daly.

Film critic Richard Schickel of Time magazine expects the same kind of mix in U.S. films in 1995 — "the usual action movies, the usual not-very-well-done comedies."

"Jim Carrey aside, I would say that the most disappointing aspect of 1994 was comedies, especially those that attempted to be in the old-fashioned romantic vein and fizzled. Like 'Speechless' and 'I.Q.' Nice premises, but they don't work out the third act," Schickel said.

"I'd like to hope for a genre revival — because I love them — but would be classic romantic comedies, wonderfully well-made. The actors are there to do them... The studios used to do them. I don't suppose people were any smarter in the '30s than they are in the '90s."

# Talent, slick production elevate TLC to new level

New records in Twin Falls stores this week:

TLC, "CrazySexyCool," (Arista Records). The problem TLC faces on their sophomore effort, "CrazySexyCool," is how to stand out from the dozens of other female trios who have flooded the R & B landscape since their debut two years ago.

The straightforward, sexually explicit lyrics that seemed so much about dating "Oooooohhh... On The TLC Tip" are standard fare for female groups today.

But while their sexual posturing

may seem a little tired, TLC's raw talent, combined with their producers' slick beats, still put T-Boz, Left Eye and Chilli above the girlie-group heap.

"Creep" is probably the best track on the album, as T-Boz defends her need to seek other male company when her man strays. Her deep, throaty vocal blends smoothly with the rich base sounds on tracks like "Red Light Special," a perfect slow jam.

She and Chilli also lend a strong lead on the witty "Kick Your Game," a song similar to Janet Jackson's "You Want This," where the confident females demand a little more creative come-on from

their suitor. Left Eye's humorous rap from the male point of view also makes this track a favorite.

The group's remake of "If I Was Your Girlfriend" has a funky dance beat and makes a great club song, though it does nothing to advance the song from the first time the artist formerly known as Prince sang it.

Nick Lowe, "The Impossible Bird" (Upstart). That he once wrote a song about a faded movie siren who died in her apartment and was eaten by her dogs, and made it bouncy and fun, should be enough to ensure Nick Lowe's legend. But the lanky Brit — who has

been pumping out wry, relentlessly infectious songs for some 20 years, either on his own records or producing those by the likes of Elvis Costello — is a woefully neglected genius.

Sure, he put out some garbage in the 1980s, and he'd be the first to admit it. But on his best days, like 1990's "Party of One" or anything he did with Dave Edmunds and Rockpile, Lowe is too hip for the room.

"The Impossible Bird" finds Lowe taking a break from the good-time pop he should be famous for, instead falling back on his folksy roots and showcasing his winning, if slightly awkward, brand of balladry.

Acoustic country guitar and plaintive bass lines by Lowe and Paul "Bassman" Rife are the common threads running through the 13 cuts.

A standout is "The Beast in Me," a song Lowe initially wrote for former father-in-law Johnny Cash. But while Cash went with menace, Lowe's version aches with the dread of a man who doesn't trust himself to love properly.

Lowe does kick out a couple of jams, particularly on "the smooth rockabilly cut" "12-Step Program (To Quit You Babe)." Step one is, "I'm gonna tear your picture down," but his slow power fails, and by Step 12 Lowe's caved in and is back with her.

# Other studios set sights on Disney's grip on animation

LOS ANGELES — The movie toso long to create and went so far over budget that Hollywood insiders began calling it Disney's Folly. Then "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs," first from the dozens of feature films, opened in 1937 and broke box office records, kicking off an unparalleled golden age of animation that became synonymous with the name Disney.

More than 50 years later, "Snow White" is the top-selling home video for the Christmas season, underlining the long-term value of creating cartoon characters that appeal to youngsters from generation to generation.

Today Disney's multimillion-dollar success with new movies such as "Aladdin" and "Beauty and the Beast" has been called responsible for creating another golden age of animation, which has poured billions into the Mouse Kingdom from box office, home video and tie-in merchandise sales.

But, as also happened the first time around, other studios are vying for a piece of the territory so far dominated by Disney. Undaunted by the string of animated disappointments outside of Disney (the only exception being Universal's eight-year joint venture with Steven Spielberg), Twentieth Century-Fox, Warner Bros. and MGM recently have invested many millions of dollars to expand or create animation divisions.

Now industry watchers are waiting to see if any rival can shake up Disney, particularly since film-studio head and animation guru Jeffrey Katzenberg defected to start his own company with director Spielberg and

recording billionaire David Geffen. In the most recent round of animated animal warfare, Disney executives scheduled the re-release of their summer blockbuster "The Lion King" on the same November weekend that two rival movies were set to open.

Expected to be the most profitable movie of all time, "Lion King's" big paw swatted a new line of "The Swan Princess" — a re-telling of Swan Lake, and Fox's "The Pagemaster," about magical storybooks that transform a timid boy (Macaulay Culkin).

Though disappointed in "The Pagemaster's" performance, Fox executives say they expect to recoup the film's \$35 million budget through tie-in revenue such as home video sales.

"Ultimately it's not anything to write home about, but we will do all right," says Bill Mechanic, president of Twentieth Century Fox and a former Disney executive. "What it really says is the pictures have to be up to snuff. The audience is very demanding today. Disney has a brand name and nobody else does."

These days, home video sales are so competitive that revenue from that market is no longer guaranteed. "Two or three years ago every animated release was profitable because of home sell-through videos," Davis says. "Nowadays

there will be losers."

In the past, many studios have tried to cut corners on animation projects, which typically take two to four years to complete, far longer than a live-action movie with actors. Now the demand for experienced animators is skyrocketing.

With hiring bids on first-year art students commonplace, annual salaries start at \$57,000 and grow to \$104,000 for master animators, according to Steve Hulett, business representative for the Motion Picture Screen Cartoonists union.

"There's a finite number of experienced talent in this town," says Doug Wood, director of animation at Steven Spielberg's company, Amblin Entertainment. "Now it's being split

by all the studios. I think it will show. It will be survival of the fittest."

With so much activity in animation, competition for creative personnel has been matched by competition for ideas. "There seems to be a shortage of really great stories. You'll get a great idea and then we find out someone else is working on it," says Wood.

Amblin's upcoming summer release, "Balo," features the famous sled dog that brought diphtheria vaccine to Nome, Alaska, in 1925. The company also is working on a story drawn from mythology, while Disney is planning a project based on stories about Hercules, the mythical strongman. Animators say Warner Bros. is developing features based on King

Tut and Cyranos de Bergerac, with at least one other studio mulling over Egyptian-themed material.

Building an animation department takes years, as evidenced by the seldom-mentioned Disney clinkers, such as "The Black Cauldron" in 1985. After several tepid warm-ups, the animation team worked its way into a now-proven formula based on strong story lines drawn from fairy tales, legends and literature.



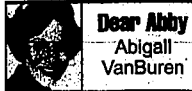


# Divorce waiting a long wait

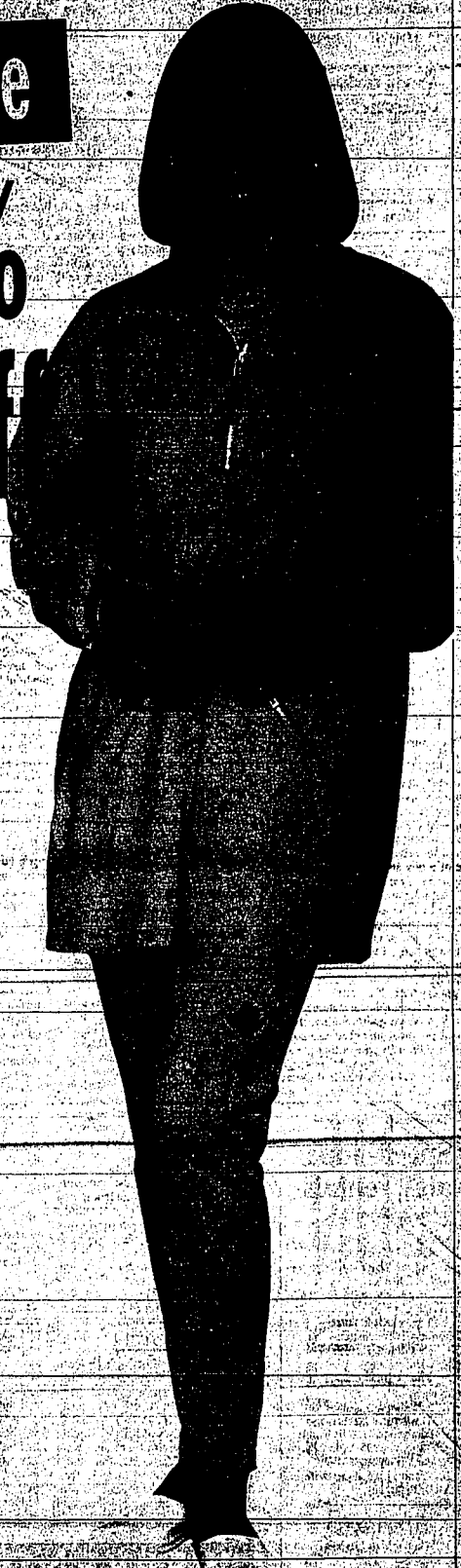

# 'Legends of the Fall,' Anthony Hopkins as Pa Cartwright

By opening today, "Legends of the Fall" beats by just two days the new television movie, "Bonanza: Under Attack," that continues the legend of the old NBC series. I mention this because "Legends of the Fall" is like an unofficial big-screen adaptation of "Bonanza."

## Movie review Brad Pitt - C+

Set in the days of the Old West, "Legends" is an epic about a rugged rancher and his three rugged sons. Their name is Ludlow, not Cartwright, and they live in Montana, not Nevada, as Ben and Ah Boy die the rebelliousness of the boys.

But, dang, I wasn't looking for a minute. The Ludlow spread doesn't have a catchy name like the Cartwright's Ponderosa, but I'd suggest the Ponderosa. My dictionary defines ponderous as "labored and dull," which strikes me as a fairly accurate description of life with the Ludlows.

Anthony Hopkins is the head of the clan, Col. William Ludlow, a cavalry officer who quit the service when he got sick of the government's miserable treatment of the Indians.

Col. Ludlow's sons include Tristan, the middle boy, played by Brad Pitt ("Interview With the Vampire"); Tristan possesses the dark spirit of Adam Cartwright and the rebelliousness of Little Joe.

Samuel, the youngest Ludlow, is portrayed by Henry Thomas; E.T.'s old friend. An earnest and sweet

young man, Samuel is like a portly, Craig version of Ross. Rounding out the family is Alfred, the eldest brother, played by Alden Quinn. With his strong sense of duty, Alfred isn't so much like one of the Cartwrights as he is like an NBC executive. Or maybe a network accountant.

Also on the Ponderosa are assorted hangers on, including a ranch hand's daughter named Isabel Two and a Cree scout known as One-Stub. I'll just bet that either Isabel Two or One Stub is the

English translation of Hop Sing. Now I don't want to push this comparison to "Boyz n the Hood," too far, because "Legends of the Fall" also reminded me of another television program: I'm thinking of "Thirty-something," that small-screen saga of the lives and loves of yuppie ad execs.

"Thirty-something" was created by Edward Zwick and Marshall Herskovitz, who are, unsurprisingly enough, co-producers of "Legends." Zwick also directed the new film, which was written by Susan

Shilliday (a former "Thirty-something" writer) and Bill Wittliff (another co-producer, who also worked on "The Cowboy Way," based on the Jim Harrison novella).

When I say that "Legends" is "labored and dull," I'm thinking of the "thirtysomething" influence. This movie also is about as whiny and yuppie-oriented as a motion picture set before the invention of junk bonds could possibly be.

Traditionally, movies that take place in the Old West have made great use of the wide-open spaces. In

many classic Westerns, the majestic scenery expresses an unmeted greatness that the strong, silent characters can't put in words.

But most of the characters in "Legends" are so chatty that there isn't much left for the scenery to say. If memory serves, certain episodes of "Bonanza" made stronger visual statements than this movie does. But, whose character speaks less than some of the others, comes off best here. His portrayal of the brooding Tristan has the dimensions of a star performance, and he carries large sections of this muddled movie almost single-handedly.

At times, he does get some help from Hopkins, who is entertainingly peppery — until a stroke hits his character and the colonel starts writing out his dialogue on a slate. And Julia Ormond manages to suggest a genuinely passionate nature as a refined Easterner who inadvertently wrecks havoc when all the Ponderosa boys fall in love with her.

Actually, "Legends of the Fall" isn't quite as bad as I'm probably

making it sound. This movie is by no means as labored and dull as, say, Kevin Costner's "Wyatt Earp" was.

But just when it starts to seem as if "Legends" might just turn into a pretty good movie, along comes some tired, soap-opera plot device (like that stroke). It may say something about the filmmakers' misunderstanding of the fundamental appeal of Westerns that in only one of the photos that TriStar Pictures sent along to promote this movie is a gun of any kind visible, and that gun is quite safely bolstered.

This could, of course, be completely accidental. But something about the inflated tone of "Legends of the Fall" suggests that the people who made it are about as comfortable with the Western form as Michael Dukakis was with Army tanks.

I get the distinct impression, in fact, that Zwick, Herskovitz and the others would have preferred to have been making a film about something else.

Something like running an ad agency. (Twin Cinema)

# 'Far From Home,' 'Crypt' reach theaters

**"Huges Learning"** — With more on its mind than an entire year's worth of standard films, John Singleton's latest work as a writer-director is set on a mythical college campus and deals with racism, date rape, sexual experimentation, and neo-Nazis among other topics. Though it is heartening to see a film addressing what is going on in society, presenting problems is not the same as dramatizing them effectively, something "Boyz N The Hood" (Lee) is an old-fashioned family entertainment filtered through more recent action flicks — gunplay and

fireballs and vehicular peril abound. Director/co-writer Stephen Sommers uses scores of animal "performers," stunning locations and special effects to create an opulent adventure yarn. And it makes its points about the nobility of the "wild child" in a far less condescending fashion than "Nell." (PG) (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

**"Little Women"** — Director Gillian Armstrong brings to vibrant life Louisa May Alcott's 1868 classic novel of female solidarity in a handsome production that combines immediacy and accessibility with an impeccable sense of period. A wonderful, superbly acted entertainment featuring an ensemble cast headed by Winona Ryder, Gabriel Byrne and Susan Sarandon. (PG, for two uses of mild language.) **"Nell"** — A young woman (Jodie Foster) is found in a remote North Carolina cabin, speaking her own language and a total mystery to a pair of doctors with competing philosophies (Liam Neeson and Natasha Richardson) who try to figure out what is to be done with her.

The creators of this hokey film have a similar difficulty trying to figure out what to do with Foster's remarkable performance, the only valid thing on screen. (PG-13, for nudity.) (Mall Cinema)

**"Pulp Fiction"** — Despite strong writing and a revived performance from John Travolta, the Quentin Tarantino film's attempts to shock can feel strained and its self-referential quality can be tedious. ## Brad Pitt: Still on edge of stardom

Brad Pitt has been the flavor of the month for so long he should start wearing a Baskin-Robbins uniform.

He has been one of Hollywood's hottest actors-on-the-verge-of-stardom since his celebrated, albeit brief, breakthrough role three years ago in "Thelma & Louise." There were the inevitable "next James Dean" whispers.

"A River Runs Through It" was supposed to be the star-making vehicle that drove him to his destiny. His fans said he was terrific in the role, and the film was a sleeper hit but not enough of a hit to shine Pitt's star. (He was lucky that the beautiful "Cool World" didn't kill his career.) "Johnny Suede" was another potential starmaker, but nobody saw it. Surely, it seemed, "Interview With The Vampire" would take care of that stardom thing. As it turned out, Tom Cruise and the film's gore quotient got all the press.

Still, Pitt has received his fair share of publicity—and hefty salary increases; at the same time as his career continues its climb. In fact, he says some of the trappings of almost-stardom already are starting to annoy him.

"You know what I read about myself the other day?" asked Pitt—who stars with Anthony Hopkins and Aidan Quinn in the Western-epic "Legends of the Fall," which opened Sunday—"I read that I've been hanging out in these gay bars and that I donated my sperm to my friend (singer) Melissa Etheridge."

Shaking his head in bewilderment (he denies the story, by the way), Pitt said he rarely does interviews anymore because of what has been written about him.

Pitt, 29, likes to downplay his reputation for wildness and his rising sex-symbol status, but his good looks, devilish eyes and sex appeal are undeniable. He walks into an interview with his shirt open three buttons, so he can't be too unhappy with the attention.

"That whole movie star thing confuses me," he said.

Well, he might be a whole lot more confused after "Legends of the Fall" opens. The film, which

spans a half-century that follows the migration west and includes World War I, is the role of a lifetime for Pitt, and he knows it.

"This is the only character I've ever had where I felt that there was no one better to play him," he said, without a hint of boast. "Don't ask me to explain it, that's just the way I feel. I like the wildness in him, I like the joy in him and I like the hate in him. His whole journey makes sense to me."

Pitt plays the middle brother of three siblings who grow up on a remote ranch in Montana after their career officer father (Hopkins) moves the family away from civilization in disgust over the government's treatment of American Indians.

Years later, the youngest brother (Henry Thomas) brings home his fiancée (Julia Ormond), who has a dramatic effect on all three brothers.

The film boils down to a lifelong battle between the oldest brother (Quinn), the straight arrow of the family, and Pitt's Tristan, the family's wild, free spirit.

"I started discussing this role two years before we started filming," the actor said. "There was something spiritual in the character that I'm not sure I can explain."

Director Ed Zwick said the film has been in development for eight years, surviving three different regimes at the studio that eventually made it. Pitt was always the first choice for Tristan, he said.

Pitt was born in Shawnee, Okla., but was reared in Springfield, Mo., where he led—according to him—a pretty normal childhood.

"I was a good kid overall," he said. "I played sports, was active in school activities and got good grades. I was good at sports but not great. I didn't want to put in the time."

Majoring in journalism at the University of Missouri, Pitt left school just before graduation and told his parents that he was moving to Los Angeles to attend a design and architecture school. That wasn't exactly true.

"I did want to be an architect, but it took too much time and I wanted to party," he said. "I realized that wasn't what I wanted to do with my life so I came out to L.A. to be an actor."

"It had to be New York or L.A. because those are where all the opportunities are. I still love Missouri; but there are no opportunities there."

Pitt worked a variety of odd jobs in L.A.—he says he was the world's worst salesman—while waiting for his break. He also signed on with three agencies that place extras in movies and TV, and he earned \$325 a day when he could find work. A year after he hit town, he landed a two-minute spot on "Dallas."

## Shoshone crushes Dietrich

SHOSHONE — The difference between No. 1 and No. 2 in Northside Conference girls' basketball is about 28 points. That was Shoshone's margin over Dietrich Thursday night as the Indians wrapped up a 12-0 conference season with a 66-38 win. Shoshone is 18-1 overall, heading into the season finale against Hagerman Jan. 16.

Niki Soloaga was too much for the Blue Devils inside, scoring 28 points despite double- and triple-teams much of the night. "That was our game plan all night, to get the ball inside," Shoshone coach Tim Chapman said.

That same game plan worked earlier in the season when the Indians won by 30 on the Blue Devils' home court.

"We'll work on rebounding a lot, and we have to get more pressure on the ball so they can't see their big people," Dietrich coach Gene Shaw said in anticipation of a third meeting in the finale of the conference tournament, which starts Jan. 20 in Shoshone.

Dietrich, 8-3 in conference play with one game remaining, will go in as the No. 2 seed behind Shoshone. The Blue Devils stayed close early, as all five starters hit a bucket to trail by just 13-10 with one minute remaining in the opening quarter.

But Soloaga hit another inside bucket and Amy Schelling hit her second three-pointer for an 18-10 Shoshone lead.

The offense for Dietrich rested almost entirely on the shoulders of 5-5 junior Janie Ward in the second period. Ward scored eight of the Devils' 10 points in the second, but it wasn't nearly enough as the Indians built a 33-20 halftime lead.

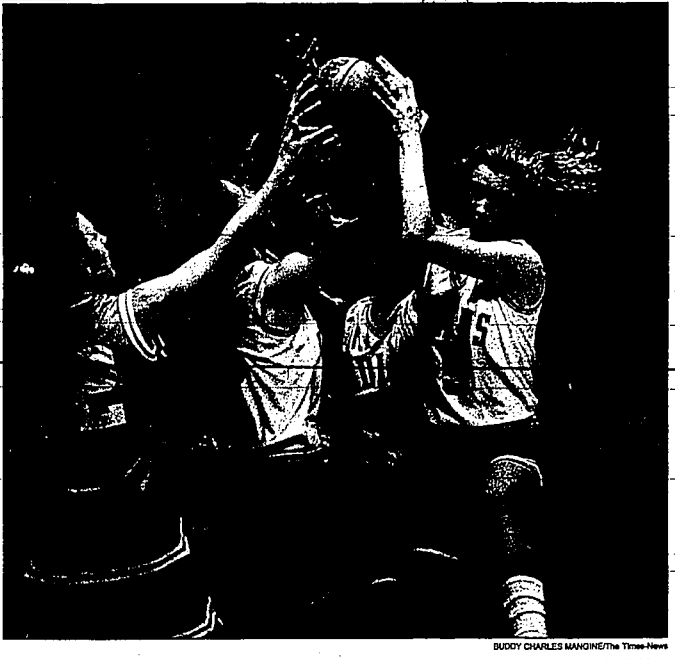
The duo of Soloaga, at 5-10, and Tara Roberts at 5-9, kept pounding away inside and dominating the offensive boards over their smaller opponents.

Shoshone scored two quick buckets to open the third quarter before Dietrich made one last run. The Blue Devils trimmed a 17-point lead to 10 despite missing a couple of easy shots before Shoshone righted itself.

Lindsay Payne hit a baseline jumper and Schelling hit another three-pointer to put the game away, 42-27.

"They're a strong team," Shaw said. "We can't get past them — not yet."

## Boise State hampered by injuries early

BOISE — The Boise State University Broncos climbed from out of the middle of the pack to win the Big Sky Conference men's basketball championship and advance to the National Collegiate Athletic Association Tournament last season.

Despite the 9-2 nonconference record, if the Broncos wish to make their third straight trip to the NCAA party, they may have to take a similar route this year.

Thursday, Bernard Walker became the third BSU player to have knee surgery this season. Walker was hurt at Utah State after fans threw ice, water and toilet paper on the floor following BSU's first basket. Ranked second in assists, third in rebounding and sixth in scoring for BSU, Walker will miss at least two weeks of the Big Sky season.

The Broncos now have 10 players available for games. "Bernard is a huge part of this team. He's a huge loss," said BSU coach Bobby Dye.

BSU and arc outshooting opponents 46-43 percent from the floor.  
John Coker, BSU's 7-foot center who finished third in the Big Sky in scoring and 10th in rebounding last year, leads the Broncos in those categories again. He's grabbing 8.3 rebounds per game, and after a 22-point performance in the Broncos' win over Rice Saturday, his scoring average is 18 points.  
Senior forward Sherman Morris averages 10.7 points and five rebounds. Guards Dar-

nell Woods and Damon Archibald average nine points apiece. "I think our chances are great," Coker said. "We've had a good preseason. We've done some good things defensively. But we've had some lapses. We have to bump up our game."

Other than the overall strength of the Big Sky this year, the biggest concern for the Broncos is free throw shooting. "We certainly have to improve at the free throw line," Dye said. "I think we've been in a slump a little bit shooting the ball periodically."

As a team, BSU has shot 59 percent from the line this season. Woods (39-48, .812) is the only Bronco shooting better than 63 percent.

"I think that's an area that's critical to any team's season," Dye said. "We're not an overpowering team. I think our margin of error is slight. It's critical for us to do the job there if we're going to be in the hunt."

AMHERST, Mass. — Top-ranked Massachusetts, undaunted by poor first-half shooting, hit three 3-pointers in the first 3 1/2 minutes of the second half and pulled away from Rutgers for an 85-68 victory Thursday night.

The Minutemen (10-1, 3-0 in the Atlantic 10) led just 36-33 at halftime after making only one of eight 3-pointers and only two outside shots. But they came out firing in the second half, taking five of their first six shots from 3-point range.

Mike Williams, who had 16 points for Massachusetts, made the score 39-35 with a 3-pointer 54 seconds into the second half. Derek Kellogg followed with a 3-pointer and, after Williams missed one, Tyrone Weeks' layup and Kellogg's 3-pointer gave the Minutemen a 47-35 lead with 3:28 gone.

Rutgers (4-7, 0-2), which scored the first basket of the half, didn't get its next one until 8:34 had elapsed. Charles Jones, who led Rutgers with 19 points, made a dunk to cut Massachusetts' lead to 60-42.

Donta Bright then sank another 3-pointer, giving the Minutemen their biggest lead, 63-42. The closest Rutgers came after that was 14 points, the last time at 75-61 with 2:56 remaining.

Lou Roe added 17 points for the Minutemen, who won their 37th straight at their campus gym — the second longest home winning streak in the nation behind Indiana's 50. Rich Ashmeade added 14 points for Rutgers.

Massachusetts' Marcus Camby, who had all 15 of his points in the first half, was ejected when he tied up his second technical foul with 1:08 left.

The Minutemen, who have struggled each time they gained the nation's top ranking this season, started slowly again Thursday night. They rose from third to first in the second week of the season but fell to fifth the next week after losing to Kansas. They

It was a sluggish effort for Missouri (11-2), which had its 16-game Big Eight unbeaten streak snapped on Monday in a loss to third-ranked Kansas. The Tigers shot just 33 percent against Notre Dame (9-5) and narrowly avoided losing consecutive games for the first time since late in the 1992-93 season.

Notre Dame also lacked spark, shooting 42 percent, but had an excuse. The Fighting Irish had to take a bus from Chicago to Columbia on Wednesday due to fog at O'Hare Airport.

O'Lincy picked up two quick fouls in the first half and was 1-for-3 with five points. He played most of the second half, was 11-for-13 at the free-throw line, and added six rebounds.

Jason Sutherland added 11 points for Missouri and reserve Corey Tate had nine points and 11 rebounds.

Lamar Justice had 15 points and 10 rebounds for Notre Dame. The Irish's leading scorer, freshman Pat Garrity, was held to four points and fouled out with 2:18 to play. Jason Williams added 10 points.

PALO ALTO, Calif. — Even though he vowed before the Orange Bowl to stay at the University of Miami, Dennis Erickson knew the moment had come to jump to the NFL.

"I felt it was the right situation for me if I was going to make that move," he said. On Thursday, Erickson was formally hired as coach of the Seattle Seahawks, returning to his home state and inheriting a team that lost nine of its last 12 games and has been a flop at the gate.

Erickson, who led the Hurricanes to two national championships, said he decided to join the Seahawks after speaking with team president David Behring.

He replaces Tom Flores, who was fired Dec. 29 after a 14-34 record with the Seahawks in three years.

Behring, whose father Ken Behring is the team's majority owner, said Erickson's contract is for four years with a one-year option. His salary will be about \$5 million over the five years.

"Coach Erickson is a man who has been extremely committed to coaching and winning his whole life," Behring said.

The announcement was made at a news conference in Palo Alto, where Erickson will coach the East team in the East-West Shrine Game on Saturday.

Erickson had a 63-9 record with the Hurricanes from 1989-94. He said when he went to Miami it was with the expectation of winning a national championship. With that goal achieved twice over, he now will be shooting for a Super Bowl title, no easy thing with the Seahawks.

"I wouldn't go anywhere unless the expectations were like that," he said.

Erickson has a promising quarterback in Rick Mizer, who should flourish under the new offensive-minded coach. There's also AFC rushing champion Chris Warren and four-time Pro Bowl defensive tackle Cortez Kennedy, who starred in his senior season at Miami in Erickson's first year there.

# Hall of Fame finalists recognize the great ones

CANTON, Ohio (AP) — Thumbs-up glances at the 15 finalists for induction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame:

**Dan Dierdorf**  
Offensive Tackle, Center  
St. Louis (1971-83)  
Although he never played in a Super Bowl, Dierdorf was a perennial all-star. After being drafted in the second round out of Michigan, he played in six Pro Bowls and was selected as an All-Pro five times. Three straight years he was picked by the players association as the best blocker in the NFL. If inducted, it would be a homecoming: he was born at Canton on June 29, 1949.

**Carl Eller**  
Defensive End  
Minnesota (1964-78), Seattle (1979)  
As one of the anchors of the Vikings' "Purple People Eaters" line, he made a habit of harassing opposing passers. Over a three-year span, he had 44 sacks. He helped the Vikings win 10 division titles.

**Jim Finks**  
Administrator  
Minnesota (1964-73), Chicago (1974-1986), New Orleans (1987-93)  
A former Pittsburgh quarterback (1949-55), as the Vikings general manager, he hired Bud Grant as coach and the team won five NFC crowns and played in two Super Bowls. As the Bears' general manager, he helped build a Super Bowl winner. He also presided over the Saints' first winning season in 1987. He died May 8, 1994, at age of 66.

**L.C. Greenwood**  
Defensive End  
Pittsburgh (1969-81)  
A 10th-round pick out of Arkansas AM&N, he spent two years as a reserve before teaming with Hall-of-Famer Joe Greene to form the left side of Pittsburgh's Steel Curtain defense. Through 13 seasons and four Super Bowl victories, he totaled 73½ sacks and recovered 14 fumbles.

**Ray Guy**  
Punter  
Oakland-L.A. Raiders (1973-86)  
Only once in 14-year career did he average less than 40 yards per punt.

**Seau, Lloyd ready for showdown**  
PITTSBURGH (AP) — Don't come looking for glamour here: Don't expect in-pronounced duos or outrageous predictions. Junior-Seau and Greg-Lloyd aren't going to provide any of that.  
If bone-jarring hits and game-turning plays are what you seek, however, then Seau and Lloyd can be very accommodating.  
The acknowledged leaders of two of the NFL's most physical defenses, the All-Pro linebackers just might supply the critical ingredient that gets either the San Diego Chargers or the Pittsburgh Steelers into the Super Bowl.  
"This is the closest we've ever been, and none of us want to let it slip away," Seau said as his Chargers prepared for Sunday's AFC championship game.  
"It's constantly in the back of your mind: One more win and we have a chance to go to the show," added Pittsburgh's Lloyd. "But we've got to get that one more win."  
To get it, both defenses must stop powerful running games. The Steelers led the NFL with 136.3 yards per game and overwhelmed Cleveland with 228 in last Saturday's playoff victory. The Chargers yielded only 87.8, the stingiest rushing defense in the AFC.  
San Diego has the only 1,000-yard runner in the game, 245-pound Natrone Means, who rushed for 139 yards

and led the NFL in punting three times and was All-Pro six years in a row from 1973 to 1978. A first-round draft pick out of Southern Mississippi, he played in seven AFC title games and three Super Bowls.

**Mike Haynes**  
Cornerback  
New England (1976-82), L.A. Raiders (1983-89)  
Over 14 seasons after being taken in the fourth round out of Arizona State, Haynes intercepted 46 passes and was All-AFC eight times. He returned punts 59 and 62 yards for touchdowns in 1976 and returned two interceptions for touchdowns, including a 97-yarder against Miami in 1982. Played out his option after 1982 season and started and intercepted a pass for Raiders in 1984 Super Bowl.

**Charlie Joiner**  
Wide Receiver  
Houston (1969-72), Cincinnati (1972-75), San Diego (1976-86)  
Although 92 players were taken before him in the 1969 draft, the Grambling product finished his NFL career with 750 catches for 12,146 yards and 65 touchdowns. Seven times he caught 50 or more passes in a season and three times he topped 70 receptions. He played more seasons as a receiver than any player in the league and is fourth in all-time receptions.

**Henry Jordan**  
Defensive Tackle  
Cleveland (1957-58), Green Bay (1959-69)  
An anchor at right defensive tackle for 11 years for the Packers, Jordan was a two-time All-NFL. Seven times he played in NFL championship games, and he also starred in the first two Super Bowls. He missed only two games in his first 12 seasons. In the 1967 NFL Western division playoff game, he had four quarterback sacks. He died in 1977 at the age of 42.

**Steve Largent**  
Wide receiver  
Seattle (1976-89)  
A fourth-round pick by Houston, the former Tulsa receiver was traded after only four preseason games for an eighth-round pick. He caught 54 passes as a rookie and went on to catch at least 50 passes in nine more seasons and 70 or more six times. He totaled 819 receptions for 13,089

yards and 100 touchdowns, and caught passes in 177 straight games. He held six major career records at the time of his retirement. Largent was elected to Congress in 1994.

**Tom Mack**  
Guard  
Los Angeles Rams (1966-78)  
Although he never made it to a Super Bowl, Mack was a frequent postseason player. He was selected to play in Pro Bowls 11 times in 13 years. One reason was his durability; he never missed a game because of injury.

**Mel Renfro**  
Cornerback, Safety  
Dallas (1964-77)  
An All-America halfback and track star at Oregon, he excelled in the secondary and as a kick returner for the Cowboys. He was selected to the Pro Bowl his first 10 seasons. He had 52 interceptions, and fueled the Dallas offense with more than 3,000 yards in kick returns. His final game, fittingly, was a victory in the 1978 Super Bowl.

**Lee Roy Selmon**  
Defensive End  
Tampa Bay (1976-84)  
After winning both the Lombardi and Outland trophies at Oklahoma in 1975, he was Tampa Bay's first draft pick ever. In a nine-year career, he led Buccaneers in sacks eight times, totaling 78½ career sacks. Selmon was picked for six Pro Bowl games in a row and was a three-time All-Pro choice.

**Dwight Stephenson**  
Center  
Miami (1980-87)  
A second-round draft pick out of Alabama, where he was an All-American selection, Stephenson was All-Pro and All-AFC every year from 1983 to 1987. He was selected to play in five Pro Bowls. He started at center for the Dolphins in two Super Bowls and three AFC championship games. His career was cut short by a knee injury.

**Lynn Swann**  
Wide Receiver  
Pittsburgh (1974-82)  
In only his second season, and first as a regular, he had 49 catches and league-high 11 touchdowns, then won MVP honors in the 1976 Super Bowl with four receptions for 161 yards. His 364 receiving yards

In his second and third seasons as a pro, he had 89 and 88 catches. In a 1981 playoff win over Miami, he had 13 receptions for 166 yards and blocked a field goal to send the game into overtime. He finished with 541 catches for 6,741 yards and 45 touchdowns.



## 49ers' owners shy from camera

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — At different times during Sunday's NFL title game between Dallas and San Francisco, television cameras will find Jerry Jones, owner, general manager and coach, the head coach of the Cowboys.  
No matter how hard the cameras try, though, they will not find the 49ers' brain trust, owner Edward DeBartolomeo, and his best buddy, team president Carmen Polley. Unless, that is, the 49ers win and they show up to accept the NFC championship trophy.  
"We darken the glass over our box so the cameras can't get in," says Polley, credited with rebuilding the 49ers despite salary cap restrictions. "The players are the show."  
Not so with Jones.  
Last week, he came down from his box to the field to be an official for a call. He holds marathons Tuesday lunches for the media, and he split with Jimmy Johnson at least in part over who got the most credit for building a two-time Super Bowl champion.  
"Television time!" In his six years as the Cowboys' owner, he's passed Al Davis of the Raiders and Art Modell of the Browns for most times picked up by the cameras — in his box, the press box and on the sidelines.  
At the dramatic end of the Cowboys' loss to Cleveland last month, there was

Jones standing on the sidelines as Jay Novacek came up inches short of the goal line, and Modell looking at Jones from the owners' box to determine how the play came out. Modell's explanation: He couldn't see the goal line so he watched Jones for his reaction.  
Jones knows no bounds — it's an upset if he walks past a bank of TV cameras without stopping to say hello and a few thousand other words. And his tongue may have been only partially in check Tuesday when, discussing the difference between his style and that of the 49ers' bosses, he said:  
"We're different in our approach to free agency, a lot of different things. The roles we play about the way we approach our activity as ownership. Mr. Polley and I as management. Mr. Seifert and I as coaches."  
Those differences became public earlier this year when Jones led the charge on Polley's manipulation of the salary cap. The 49ers, Jones said, were mortgaging the future by signing veterans for the minimum salary then adding incentives that would count against future caps.  
But Polley notes that the 49ers have come out even better than they had expected. "Even if we win the Super Bowl, the most we'll have from this year in next year's cap is \$1.6 million," he says. "It will go up at least that much for 1995."

The Cowboys maintain those victories mean little now, but the 49ers want to prove their defense had improved this season. They seemed to establish just that. The Cowboys (Michael Irvin in particular) are crowing that they'll win.  
The Niners (William Floyd in particular) are suggesting that all that crowing reflects insecurity. More relevant is Smith's health.

## Sticky strip helps NFL players breathe easier

CHANHASSEN, Minn. (AP) — A snorer's lament has produced a new accessory for the pro football player who wants to stay in style and breathe a little easier.  
Along with the earrings, gold chains and dew mags, wide receivers, running backs and others are sporting sticky strips on the bridge of their nose. This fashion statement, though, might actually help the players' performance.  
Breathe Right's name, and it's stuck its beak right into the huddle as the NFL prepares to pick its two Super Bowl teams this weekend.  
The brainchild of a college dropout with a deviated septum, the little plastic patch adorns the schnozzoes of stars such as wide receiver Jerry Rice of the San Francisco 49ers, defensive lineman Jim Jeffcoat of the Dallas Cowboys and running back Herschel Walker of the Philadelphia Eagles.  
Bruce Johnson invented the thing to help those with stuffy noses stop snoring and breathe easier, so they could get a good night's sleep. There's certainly a market for it —

Sports easy-breathing device surveys show 90 million Americans snore, and 37 million of those have a chronic problem.  
But because the device opens nasal passages by pulling up on the outside of the nostrils, players such

as Rice have taken to using them even when there's no cold or cough around and no thought of catching a canyap at the bottom of a pileup.  
CNS Inc., a medical services company based in this Minneapolis suburb, sent samples of Breathe Right to each NFL team last fall. The device, put on the nose as a lark while watching television at home, about two months ago.  
"And lo and behold, I instantly could breathe better," Davis said.  
The trainer read the manufacturer's claim that it increases nasal openings by up to 31 percent. So he passed some around the locker room and Walker, suffering with a cold, tried one in the next game against Washington. When several Redskins' players asked if his nose was broken, Walker replied: "No, it helps me breathe better."  
Word spread. Rice saw Walker wearing a Breathe Right on TV and had his agent call around to find out more. The NFL's all-time toughest leader and teammates such as running back William Floyd have

been sporting them ever since.  
Rice "feels like it helps keep his nostrils clear," 49ers trainer Lindsay McLean said. "He likes it."  
Rice, in fact, has become a speeding billboard for Breathe Right. A day after he was spotted with the nose patch during a Monday night game, CNS stock jumped 14 percent.  
CNS, which specializes in medical equipment for sleep-disorder diagnosis, makes no claims that Breathe Right can give athletes a boost.  
"We're not making any claims about performance," said Dr. Dan Cohen, chairman and chief executive officer of CNS. "But once you realize that this allows you to pull in more air, you get the idea."  
Sales for Breathe Right last year, its first full year on the market, were estimated at \$2.5 million-\$3 million, Cohen said. The publicity that developed after Rice and Walker were shown on TV with the patches was welcomed, he said, although it's taken a while for people to realize just what they are looking at.

## BSU track star barred from competition

**BOISE** — Boise State senior Kerry Lawyer, who won two individual track titles in the Big Sky Conference track championships last year, has been declared academically ineligible. The school said Thursday Lawyer will not compete this season. He holds school records in the 55, 100 and 200-meters. Last year, Lawyer won Big Sky titles in the indoor track meet and won the outdoors 200 meters.

He also won the indoor 55-meter league championship in 1992. Lawyer also played for the Boise State football team for three years as a wide receiver and return specialist but passed up his senior season last fall. Boise State opens the indoor track season Saturday at Pocatello when both the mens and womens teams compete in the Snake River Open at Holt Arena.

## Hoosier, Tar-Heel receive soccer prize

**WASHINGTON** — Indiana midfielder Brian Maisonneuve and North Carolina forward Tisha Venturini were picked Thursday as winners of the Heisman Trophy, awarded to the top college soccer players in the United States. Maisonneuve, the Big Ten player of the year, scored 13 goals for the Hoosiers, who lost to Virginia in the NCAA final. He scored 43 goals during his career at Indiana. Venturini scored 21 goals, including eight in the NCAA tournament, as the Tar Heels won their ninth straight title and 12th in 13 years.

## Illegal aliens arrested at Olympic Village

**ATLANTA** — Immigration authorities raided the Olympic Village construction site on the Georgia Tech campus on Thursday and arrested 37 illegal aliens. The Immigration and Naturalization Service said it had received a complaint that undocumented workers, mostly Mexicans, were replacing Americans on the project at cheaper wages. He said the illegal workers were being paid \$10 to \$13 an hour. "Combined operations such as this will guarantee that only legal Americans are employed at Olympic sites," INS spokesman Tom Fischer said. "This effort demonstrates the concern and dedication of the law enforcement community to ensure the success and safety of the 1996 Games."

## Lawyers say Fortay made secret tapes

**MIAMI** — Former Miami quarterback Bryan Fortay and his father, Peter, secretly tape-recorded 16 conversations with Dennis Erickson and two other coaches, university lawyers alleged. The conversations are part of Fortay's \$10 million federal lawsuit against the university alleging breach of contract because Erickson started Geno Torretta ahead of Fortay in 1992. Transcripts quote Erickson, who this week left Miami to coach the Seattle Seahawks, as telling Peter-Fortay in 1990: "As far as I'm concerned, in all honesty, Bryan Fortay will be the next starter here. In the next two years, he'll play here and he'll have the opportunity to win the Heisman." Torretta won the Heisman in 1992.

## Oregon State basketball coach retires

**PORTLAND, Ore.** — Jim Anderson, basketball coach at Oregon State for the past six years, has retired from the university, effective at the end of last month. Anderson was among many university employees who opted for early retirement before a law took effect that would have cut their monthly benefits, officials at the university and the Public Employees Retirement System said Thursday. Anderson, 57, will continue as coach through the end of the season under a part-time contract. However, his retirement almost certainly means he will not return as coach next season.

## Report of Davis-Angels contract denied

**PITTSBURGH** — Chili Davis's agent on Thursday denied a report that the outfielder and the California Angels had tentatively agreed to an \$11.25 million, three-year contract. The Los Angeles Times, citing unidentified sources, said Thursday that Angels owner Jackie Autry still must approve the deal. "There's no basis for that," agent Tom Reich said of the report. "That's not true. There is nothing new that's developed in the last few weeks or months."

## Woman coach waits for hype to end

**SPOKANE** — The St. George's Dragons and their new coach are looking forward to the day when they won't have to deal with the usual question, "What are you going to do about the locker-room situation?" Any apprehension players may have had about their first-year coach disappeared during the first week of practice, senior Dan Cook said of Jennifer Mountain. "I think we just wanted a good basketball coach, and she fit the credentials," Cook said as the Dragons (6-4) prepared to meet rival and defending State Class B defending champion Northwest Christian on Friday. "Until she played against us (in practice) I had no idea she was a good basketball player," Cook said. Mountain, a 25-year-old Portland, Ore., native, scored 1,422 points for Gonzaga University women's basketball team from 1988-91 to become the school's third all-time leading scorer.

## Umpires, owners make no progress

**NEW YORK** — Negotiators for locked-out umpires and major league owners met Thursday without progress. Management negotiator Robert Kheel and umpires' union head Richie Phillips discussed the 12-day-old lockout over lunch at a Chinese restaurant. The two will meet next Thursday in Philadelphia. "The thought is maybe we'll find something in the underbrush and clear it," Kheel said. Umpires are asking for a 60-percent pay rise over the next four years. The American and National leagues stopped their salaries on Jan. 1.

## Cardinals announce lower ticket prices

**ST. LOUIS** — The St. Louis Cardinals announced Thursday that they will roll back ticket prices for spring training games, regardless if major leaguers are open. The Cardinals will open their spring training season on March 4 against the Baltimore Orioles at Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg, Fla. They will play 13 home games. The most expensive field and box seats will go for \$6.50 instead of the usual \$8. Reserved grandstand will cost \$5.50 instead of \$7. Bleacher seats, which are sold only on game day, will be \$2.50 instead of \$3.

## Pippen voices discontent with Bulls

**CHICAGO** — Scottie Pippen went out and he says he doesn't care where he ends up. "No place could be worse than here," the Chicago Bulls' forward said Wednesday night before the Bulls routed the Philadelphia 76ers 115-77. Pippen — widely considered one of the five best players in the NBA — has made no secret lately of his distaste for Bulls management, especially for general manager Jerry Krause. Just two weeks ago, he called Krause a liar and said Krause was allowing the team to deteriorate by letting power forward Horace Grant leave for Orlando as a free agent. Pippen had never demanded to be traded. But Wednesday night, he said, "Trade me or Krause." Pippen leads the Bulls in all major statistical categories, but his salary is not among the top 40 in the NBA. He's the fourth-highest paid player on his team, having signed a five-year, \$18 million extension in 1991. Pippen, 29, won't become a free agent until he is 32 in the 1997-98 season.

# NFL draft lets in formerly eligible players

**NEW YORK (AP)** — Tamarick Vanover, who left Florida State after his sophomore season and played in the Canadian Football League last year, wants to switch to the NFL. Vanover, a receiver and kick returner who played for the CFL's Las Vegas Posse in 1994, has been granted permission to enter the NFL draft along with 32 other players who didn't sign up their college eligibility. The list released Thursday by the NFL includes players who gave up their remaining eligibility and have been out of high school for at least three seasons. The application

deadline was Wednesday. The most prominent players are juniors who had previously announced their intentions to enter the April draft. They include Heisman Trophy winner Rashawn Salaam of Colorado, Penn State tailback Ki-Jana Carter, Miami defensive tackle Warren Sapp, Brigham Young quarterback John Walsh and Notre Dame safety Bobby Taylor. But the list also contains lesser-known names like Utah State running back Profall Grier, Georgia Tech defensive tackle Elliott Fortune and former Arizona State teammate Brian Easter and Johnny Thomas, who both

sat out last season because of academic problems. Vanover wanted to enter the NFL draft after leaving Florida State, but wasn't allowed because he hadn't been out of high school for three years. So he went to the CFL's expansion team in Las Vegas, where he caught 23 passes for 385 yards and three touchdowns. Vanover also scored on a 90-yard kick-off return and a 105-yard punt return. The Posse finished 5-13 and won't be back in Las Vegas next season because of financial problems. The franchise is expected to move or fold. Other players on the "special eligibil-

ity" list are Tony Bates of Iowa; Greg Black and Curtis Johnson of North Carolina; Blake Brockmeyster of Texas; Derrick Alexander and Devin Bush of Florida State; Shannon Clavelle of Colorado; Lee DeRamus of Wisconsin; Brian Fitzgerald of North Carolina State; Ty Law, Trezelle Jenkins and Co. Foster of Michigan; Brandell Jackson of Baylor; Jack Jackson of Florida; Greg Landry and Mike Mamula of Boston College; Curtis Mingo of Pittsburgh; Lovell Pinney of Texas; Brian Robinson of Auburn; James Stewart of Miami; and Kirby Stringer, Lorenzo Styles and Craig Powell of Ohio State.

# Mucha leads LPGA tourney

**ORLANDO, Fla. (AP)** — Powered by a hole-in-one on the 17th hole, Barb Mucha shot a 4-under-par 68 Thursday to take a one-shot lead after the first round of the Tournament of Champions, the year's opening LPGA event. Playing in her hometown, Mucha toured the Jack Nicklaus-designed Grand Cypress Resort course at 36-32, despite making bogey on No. 18 following her second LPGA course. "I hit a 6-iron kinda fat," she said of the hole-in-one on the 164-yard hole. "It hit about six paces on the green and kept rolling. I really thought it was going to be short but it was dead on line. Then it just kept rolling and rolling and then it was, 'My God, it went in.'" One stroke back was Beth Daniel, the 1994 LPGA Player of the Year. Betsy King and Tammie Green were at 71. Although the 39-player field is made up of LPGA winners over the last two seasons, Mucha, Daniel, King and Green were the only golfers to break par. Laura Davies and Dottie Mochrie are at par, with four scores in the 80s.

Daniel had five birdies and a double-bogey in her 69. "I hit a perfect drive on No. 7, then hit a nice, fat 7-iron right in the water," Daniel said of the double-bogey. "Overall, I didn't hit it real solid, but I played smart." Mucha had little trouble. "I was hitting a lot of good shots all day and I finally started to make a few putts on the back and before you know it I was 4-under," she said. Mucha, beginning her eighth LPGA season, recently returned from a sports performance camp where she worked on her mental approach to golf. "It was kind of a goal of mine to come out this year with a different attitude," she said. "I know I'm a good player. I just had to believe that. The mental game, goah—if you can control that, you can be a great player. And I think that's what all the great players have out here. A lot of times the last couple of years, I'd just go through the motions. I just felt like I was shortchanging my ability. Now, this is a risk for me. I'm stepping out on the limb and saying, 'Yes, I am. I'm a great player.'"

Furyk, the first player off the tee on the 6,975-yard ocean-side course, turned in a bogey-free round, with birdies on two par-5s and two par-3s as well as on a par-4. Four of his birdies came on puts in the 10-12-foot range with the fifth 3-footer after blasting out of a bunker on the 18th. "The last time I played in wind

"The wind is hard to judge,"

Jones said. "It blew you around when you were putting." "The wind is the No. 1 evil factor out here," Brooks added. "It's guesswork. But I was pretty lucky because only I misclubbed two or three times." "I remember playing at 8 o'clock here when it was calm," Lehman said. "Today, it was galling." Defending champion Brett Ogle was at 71 along with David Lead, who won in 1990. John Daly, making his second start after a five-month layoff, shot 73.

# Ex-con suspected of stalking former Bucs owner

**TAMPA, Fla. (AP)** — Ralph Gene Johnson, an ex-convict accused of plotting to kidnap former Tampa Bay Buccaneers president Gary Culverhouse, left prison in 1992 with \$100 from the state and, apparently, with big plans. He shaved his head and mustache, changed his name and got a new passport, authorities said. "Johnson took a trip to Russia, came back to the United States, then went to Bogota, Colombia, of the fields said. At the time he called himself Daniel Beardle. Police, who are investigating his background, want to know how could an unemployed ex-con travel the world? And what was he doing in those locales? Detectives said Johnson is a con man who kept notes of a complicated scheme to kidnap Culverhouse and her 20-year-old daughter, built remote-

control devices to capture a \$1 million ransom and secretly surveilled the Culverhouse estate 50 times. Johnson, 45, was accused Tuesday of stalking Culverhouse at her home and trailing her daughter, Leigh Chapman, at Eckerd College, where she is a student. Gary Culverhouse, 47, is the daughter of late Buccaneers owner Hugh Culverhouse, who died in August, leaving a \$380 million estate. Authorities said they expect to learn more about Johnson as they look into numerous aliases he has used since his release from prison two years ago. Detectives said they have tied him to at least 47 truck thefts — and 12 aliases. Police throughout the Southeast are investigating whether the crimes extend beyond Florida, said Hillsborough Sheriff's Lt. Stan Doss.

Johnson planned to grab one of the two women and keep her in a U-Haul with food and water and demand a ransom, according to officials. "Mr. Johnson is a very complex individual. He's got many talents," said Doss. "There are some months where he disappeared. It seems to be a blank." Johnson's uncle, Forrest Haynes of Plant City, said his nephew was a "bright child" and scored over 160 on an IQ test he took before enlisting in the U.S. Army when he was 16. He later was discharged when the Army learned of his age, Haynes said. "He could take a lawn mower engine apart when he was about 5 or 6 and put it back together like an adult mechanic," he said. "If he'd have used his intelligence for something else, I'm sure he could have done anything he wanted to."

# NHL players pause before voting on contract

**NEW YORK (AP)** — NHL players, still concerned with the "loose ends" of their labor agreement, reviewed the settlement Thursday before voting on the contract recommended by their bargaining committee. Player representatives say the owners' proposal will be ratified, but not overwhelmingly. The NHL Players Association scheduled a conference call with its player representatives Thursday. It was not immediately clear when the actual vote would take place. "We want to make sure all the players are well-informed," said Larry Murphy, players' rep for the Pittsburgh Penguins. "The players will hold a secret vote, official announcement of which presumably will be made Friday. A majority vote is needed for approval. An NHL spokesman said it was hoped commissioner Gary Bettman and union head Bob Goodenow would hold a joint news conference in New York, but before the results of the vote is known. Murphy said this vote is more encompassing than the one that settled the 10-day strike in 1992. "This won't be a walk in the park like it was then," he said. While Murphy doesn't expect a ringing endorsement, he was confident the deal will be ratified by the rank-and-file, ending the 103-day lockout. "It's not the deal we had hope for," Murphy said. "We made many concessions, but the deal turned out to be fair and reasonable."

"I'm pretty optimistic." "It's possible not all of the some 700 NHL players will vote. Some may still be in Europe, where they have been playing." "If there seems to be a vast majority of guys that ratify it, they may not get everybody in," Ladouceur said. "The agreement was worked out during three days of negotiating this week involving Goodenow and Bettman."

# Rules approved for high school football

**KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP)** — High school quarterbacks will be allowed to intentionally throw the ball to stop the clock in one of a series of rules changes approved for high school football next fall. The change will allow a quarterback to intentionally throw the ball forward on game as long as it is thrown immediately after receiving a direct hand-to-hand pass. The rule is one of 16 passed by the National Federation of State Rules Committees at its Jan. 7-9 meeting in Albuquerque, N.M., and is similar to one already in effect at the college and professional levels for several years. "Since quarterbacks will be able to spike the ball legally late in games to conserve time, it takes pressure off the officials to make a difficult judgment call when quarterbacks are trying to legally stop the clock," said Dick Schildner, assistant director of the Kansas City-based National Federation of State High School Associations and editor of high school football rules. "The common practice, until the rule change, was to 'drop back and throw an incomplete pass in an area where there was an eligible offensive receiver to avoid a penalty.'"

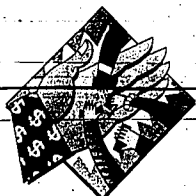

## No. 1 funds pretty good in year 2 too



NEW YORK (AP) — In the changeable world of stock mutual funds, yesterday's champion can easily become today's or tomorrow's chump.

The pattern was set early in the industry's history, when the go-go fund managers of the 1960s mismanaged funds the "no-no" names of the early 1970s.

Of all the maxims used to warn fund investors, few are so often quoted as the time-honored disclaimer: "Past performance is no guarantee of future results."

There is much to heed in all this. Nevertheless, says one experienced fund-watcher, the historical record also makes an important contrary point.

Sheldon Jacobs, publisher of the newsletter *The No-Load Fund-Investor* in Irvington-on-Hudson, N.Y., says people who invest with hot funds can in fact be handsomely rewarded by something he calls "persistence of performance."

Jacobs draws this conclusion from the results that would have been achieved by investing each year since 1976 in the fund ranking as the No. 1 performer the previous year among diversified no-load funds.

"If you had adopted this strategy 19 years ago, you would have done more than four times as well as if you had invested in the average equity fund," he reports.

In the period he studied, no fund topped repeated as the top performer. The typical results each achieved dropped off dramatically from the average gain of 57.1 percent in the stand-out year.

But the funds still tallied an average year-after return of 23.2 percent.

Yet at the downside worked out to be pretty mild, in the setting of a long bull market for stocks. In only two years did the hypothetical investor in this strategy suffer losses — the bear-market years of 1981, when the Hartwell Leverage Fund was down 13.2 percent, and 1990, when the Twentieth Century Vista Fund was down 15.7 percent.

Jacobs's study excludes international funds and nondiversified funds such as sector and gold funds, whose portfolios tend to rise and fall with the changing moods of the marketplace.

"It is imperative that only diversified funds are considered," Jacobs writes in the January issue of his letter.

"Diversified funds will generally continue to be above-average performers because of management continuity and portfolio momentum. The performance of non-

diversified funds is much more erratic."

The long-term record of Jacobs's study gives no assurance whatever that it would work well in short periods of time. In the two down years cited earlier, for instance, the featured fund lost more ground than the average fund did.

In up years, a fund may achieve only a small fraction of its initial-year success — or, on occasion, it may do a lot better, if the stock market climate improves significantly.

Anyone who follows this investment approach, buying and selling a new fund each year, will have capital gains taxes to deal with, over and above the usual distributions funds make to all their shareholders.

In 1994, the fund spotlighted by the persistency-of-performance system was PBIG Growth, which had ranked No. 1 in 1993 with a 46.5 percent gain. Last year, its return was a modest 4.8 percent — though that compared nicely with the 0.7 percent loss posted by the average no-load fund.

Now in 1995, the system has nominated a sister to PBIG Growth, called PBHG Emerging Growth, which was up 23.8 percent in 1994. Like many funds that reach the top in the annual performance rankings, "it's a volatile fund that stays fully invested," Jacobs observes.

Systems like this, no matter how soundly based they may seem, have a history of working less well as they gain more recognition. But the story told by Jacobs does suggest that a top-performing fund may be much more than just a flash in the pan.

South cited two reasons for losing today's slam. "We got a bad break in both majors," he said. "I make it either null or down 1x. He missed a third reason. He missed a marked endplay against West."

Dummy's diamond ace won and South wondered if he had bid enough. The answer came quickly. The two top trumps were cashed and East discarded, there was an obvious trump loser. South turned his attention to spades and when that suit failed to split, South had another loser and the slam suffered a one-trick set.

On a good day, the grand slam would make easily. Thirteen tricks are there if trumps are 2-2 and spades are 3-2 (about a 28% chance).

Even on a bad day, South is cold for 12 tricks. However, he must make West help him. After cashing the two top trumps, South should cash the top clubs, the spade king and the diamond king. After he ruffs a diamond, he leads a trump to West and West is stuck.

In today's layout, West must lead a minor and South enjoys a ruff and discard. Had West held the spade stack instead of the club, the endplay would still operate. Regardless of which spade West exited with, South would play low from dummy and pick up the suit with no loser.

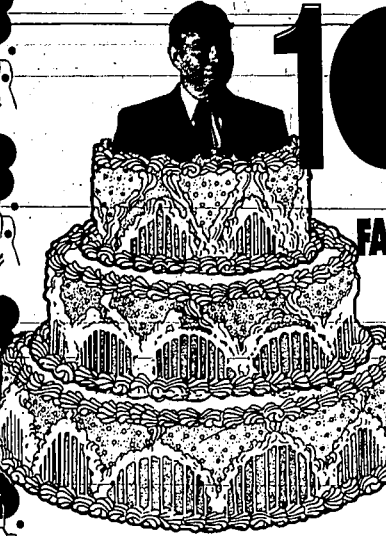

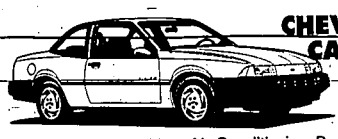

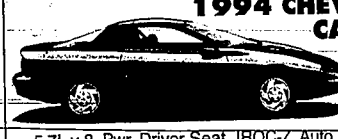

# Fox gets 'Smart' for new run

Would you believe Fox is bringing back all of your favorite shows from the 1960s and 1970s?

No?

Then would you believe Fox is reviving "C.S.M."?

Fans of the original series should be pleased to discover that this new incarnation, airing Sundays, maintains the relentless silliness that made the original so popular.

In the opening of the pilot, K.A.O.S., the diabolically evil organization bent on world domination, is now a multinational corporation obsessed with global economic supremacy. The Nazi-like thugs of the original are now replaced with more fashion-conscious bad-guys.

Don Adams as Barbara Feldon reprise their roles as Maxwell Smart and his wife, 99. Max is now the chief of C.O.N.T.R.O.L., and 99 is a U.S. congresswoman. Feldon describes returning to this series as a warm homecoming.

"It was so sweet to see Don again, we always had such a great working relationship," she says. "And it was always so much fun to act with him.

"It's a funny little schizophrenic thing that 99 and Max have this real deep abiding affection for each other, and it's just so lovely to do those scenes again with him."

Another familiar face fans will see is that of Bernie Kopell ("The Love Boat"), who Feldon says reprises his role as K.A.O.S. bad-guy Conrad Sligfield for one episode. However, she adds that much of the new show centers around a new cast.

Andy Dick stars as Max and 99's son, Zachary, who becomes

C.O.N.T.R.O.L. agent in the pilot. A bumbling clutz like his father, Zachary is paired with the sexy and capable Agent 66, played by Elaine Hendrix.

Coincidentally, both Feldon and Hendrix began their careers as dancers.

The gadgets that were such a staple of the original series get some updates in the new "Get Smart." The cone of silence has been replaced by a room with two soundproof booths, wherein the occupants talk into a microphone and their speech is transmitted to a satellite, encoded and bounced back to the other booth. Of course, nothing hard is understandable.

While Max still uses his shoe phone, Zachary has a sneaker phone (no mention of it came free with his "Sports Illustrated" subscription). New items include the fax tie, a neat little sound effects pen and the brassiere gun, used by Agent 66 (45 cal-

iber, of course). Feldon says her character has not really changed from the original series.

"In terms of just her personality and character, there's really not much difference," she says. "Her attitude toward Max is exactly the same; she's absolutely adoring, gentle, maternal and supportive ... and capable."

"I think what the new series does is bring out a more maternal side of her, because her son, Zachary, is now the major agent. She's extremely maternal toward Zach and very much a mentor to Agent 66."

Even though she is no longer an agent, 99 still has not been given a first name.

"She never had a name, and I don't suppose she ever will," she says. "They're calling her Congresswoman Smart, I believe."

With the new characters leading the cast, Max and 99 are relegated to supporting charac-

ters. Feldon says she doesn't miss being in the center of the action.

"Do I miss going through a car wash with the top down and my eyelashes getting into my eyes? No," she says. "Do I miss being drowned in a phone booth? Not at all. Do I miss having gallons of water poured on me on a cruise? No, I don't miss being wet."

Feldon says her involvement in the new "Get Smart" is "ideal" for her.

"I had been looking to play a small ongoing character in a series," she says. "I can continue my own activities in voice-over (for commercials), and I do a one-woman show ("Love for Better and Worse"). I'm going to be doing that in New York in February."

All in all, Feldon seems content with having a limited role on the show.

"It seems like a drier job than it used to be, which is a plus," she says.

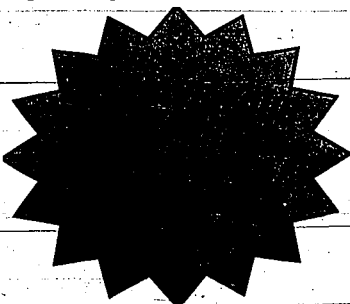

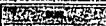

Daytime soaps, unlike most other TV programs, don't have a season, they continue with new shows 52 weeks a year. But now that a new year has begun, it's time to look back and note what the soaps brought viewers in 1994 — the good, the bad and the indifferent.

Starting on a positive note, "The Young and the Restless" has to be commended for consistently keeping storylines focused in reality and developing from that gratuitous plotting. During the past year, one of the more gripping and well-done storylines concerned Luan and Jack and their son, Keemo.

The American Keemo had so much resentment built up with his American father (Jack Abbott) and his mother (Luan), whom he thought abandoned him. When Luan arrived in Genoa City and enlisted the services of Christine to help locate her son, the story took some interesting turns but never sank into melodrama that was hovering in the shadows.

That brings us to Peter Bergman, who gets our vote as the best actor of the year. Bergman is a two-time Daytime Emmy Award winner for his work as Jack Abbott on "The Young and the Restless," but this is the year he truly deserves the gold statuette. When Keemo and Jack confronted each other in a highly charged scene in one past season, Jack's emotional outcry for the son he never knew to accept him as his father was as heart-wrenching as soap scenes get with one definite distinction: it never got to the main stage.

Phillip Moon, who's been as Keemo, and Elizabeth Sung, who plays Luan, also contributed greatly to the success of the storyline which is still being highlighted in the top-rated soap.

"As the World Turns" entered its 40th year on CBS this past fall and is still going strong. And holding her own after 35 years as Lisa is Ellen Futon, the veteran

actress who has certainly struck a coup or two from the Fountain of Youth. Susan Lucci's Erica Carter is always cited as TV's most enduring "bitch goddess" for her long tenure on ABC's "All My Children," but Fulton's Lisa has pulled just as many outrageous stunts, she's infuriated as many people, and she's her own record in the matrimonial sweepstakes, having wedded and bedded a variety of men over the years.

Now for the worst. The "pseudo-exorcist" plot on "Days Of Our Lives" involving Dr. Martina Evans being possessed by the devil (a Pul-Zeelec "Guiding Light" completely missing the boat in hiring Marcy Walker (one of the better actresses toiling in the soap world), then giving her lifeless stones to wade through. And before we stop casting, I'm sure many viewers wanted to throw in the turban while "The Bold and the Beautiful" kept Taylor prisoner in Morocco. Those endless scenes used the same dialogue over and over. And, the tacky sets of the Moroccan palace looked like they were inspired by a high school production. Circs 1950, of the operetta "Desert Song."

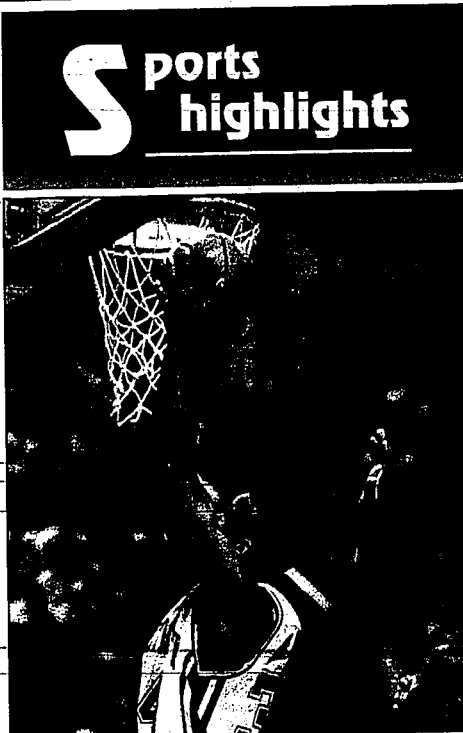

# New networks fill their airwaves with old ideas

So you've got the bucks to start a new TV network. Maybe you've got the guts and the will to glory too. But how to fill that airtime? ...Hey, no problem. Just whip together a few sexy sitcoms and action shows and follow the surefire formula of ratings-proven de ja vu. It's mostly spiced T-R-E-K and P-O-X.

## THE WB NETWORK

On WB, young-skewing sitcoms with proven pedigrees are king.

"The Wayans Bros." (sitcom; 8 p.m. Wednesday), created by Shawn and Marlon Wayans of "In Living Color," and "Living Single" creator Yvette Lee Bowser are executive consultant. Shawn and Marlon Wayans star as different-as-day-and-night brothers, one a free spirit, one an opportunistic schemer, with John Witherspoon as their disapproving, fast-talking father.

The concept: A buddy comedy with lots of "I Love Lucy"-style physical gags and low-brow humor a la "Sanford and Son."

The outlook: Surprisingly good. The Wayans' fans are hugely loyal to the hip duo of Shawn and Marlon, not to mention brothers Damon ("Blunkman") and Keenen Ivory Wayans ("A Low Down Dirty Shame"). Sure, it's up against Foxbuster "90210," but "Wayans" seems a better choice than NBC's lumbering "Cosby Mysteries" or the silly "Women of the House" on CBS.

"The Parent 'Hood" (sitcom; 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, premieres Jan. 18). Created by filmmaker/comedian Robert Townsend, with Andrew Nichols and Darrell Vickers ("The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson"), Townsend stars as young-at-heart professor Robert Peterson, who tackles marriage and fatherhood in unconventional but caring style. With Suzanne Douglas ("Jason's Lyric") as law-adjacent wife, Jeni.

The concept: A baby-boomer "The Cosby Show," only more struggling, and sillier.

The outlook: It's great to

have a sitcom about an intact nuclear family again.

Townsend is always appealing, but everything seems to rest on cast chemistry. "Unhappily Ever After" (sitcom; premieres 8:30 p.m. Wednesday; moves to 9 p.m. Jan. 18). Created by Ron Leavitt ("Married ... With Children," which successfully launched Fox. Also, "Unhappily's" outrageousness is more appealing than competitor "Double Rush," CBS' "Fax!" rebash starring Robert Pastorelli ("Murphy Brown").

... With Children."

The outlook: This humor seems too brittle and bitter to be appealing for long. But that's what was said about the phenomenon called "Married ... With Children," which successfully launched Fox. Also, "Unhappily's" outrageousness is more appealing than competitor "Double Rush," CBS' "Fax!" rebash starring Robert Pastorelli ("Murphy Brown").

## UNITED PARAMOUNT NETWORK

At UPN, Tried and True is the motto. From trekking with Kate Mulgrew and

crew on "Star Trek: Voyager" to action-adventure shows and more sitcoms, everything tastes like reheated leftovers.

"Star Trek: Voyager" (drama; premieres 8 p.m. Monday, Jan. 16). From producers Rick Berman, Michael Piller and Jeri Taylor, who helmed the other spinoffs. In the 24th century, Capt. Kathryn Janeway (Kate Mulgrew) and crew take the USS Voyager into a distant part of the galaxy, where they get lost and where lurks their enemy, the Maquis. To find Federation space, Maquis and Voyager must cooperate.

The concept: Yet another orbital spin for Trekkers.

The outlook: With the "Star Trek" legend behind it, this one will fly as high as a new network show can, given its clearance in 10 percent to 15 percent less of the country than ABC, CBS, Fox and NBC. But it airs opposite strong competition, from "The Nanny" on CBS to NBC's "Fresh Prince" and sitcom "Melrose Place" on Fox.

"Platypus Man" (sitcom; 9 p.m. Monday, Jan. 23). From "Golden Girls" executive producers Mort Nathan and Barry Fanaro. Richard Jeni stars as a cable

cooking-show host hungry for love. His bartender brother, best friend and neighbor add to the comedic hijinks.

The concept: Yet another vehicle for a smart-mouthed single guy and pals, like "Seinfeld."

The outlook: The cable cooking-show scenario could be a recipe for clever garnishes and twists. Remember Betty White as "Happy Homemaker" host Sue Ann Nivens on "The Mary Tyler Moore Show"? This one has the potential to create "Models Inc." on Fox but should fall to "Murphy Brown" on CBS.

## The Fight for Equality African Americans in the Military

African Americans served in the military throughout our country's history.

A willingness to fight for their country was a way to prove that they were entitled to be treated as equal and responsible citizens.

### Revolutionary War



An African American, Crispus Attucks, became a hero as the first American killed in the lead-up to the Revolution. He was killed by British troops in Boston in 1770.

During the American Revolution, thousands of African Americans won their freedom from slavery by volunteering to serve, fighting on both sides.

Many called this opportunity to win their freedom in exchange for service their own "declaration of independence."

This war freed many slaves and helped to end slavery in the North.



The month of February is African-American History Month. Look through your paper for news of African Americans.

### Civil War

During the Civil War, about 200,000 blacks served in the Union army and navy. They fought not only to win their own freedom, but also to put an end to slavery.

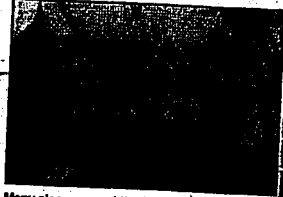
Being in the service offered African Americans a chance at an education. The pay they received also made it possible for them to support their families. In the Civil War, black women served the Union as spies and as nurses in army hospitals.



Harriet Tubman was an unpaid soldier-spy-nurse during the Civil War. She was often in the field with the soldiers. As a leader in the Underground Railroad, she also helped many slaves escape.



In the Civil War, many African Americans supported the Union forces as laborers. They did such jobs as digging trenches and building breastworks, or protective dirt walls.



Many also were soldiers. This Civil War poster urges blacks to join the Union Army. These soldiers served under white officers.

Frederick Douglass (1817-1895) was an outstanding black newspaper editor, author and speaker. He was among the first abolitionists (fighters against slavery) to call for military service for black men. He often helped recruit black soldiers.
