Winter remains wet

TWIN FALLS - Hammered by a succession of soggy storms from the Pacific, Idaho is enjoying its wettest winter in nearly a decade.

"This is the best snowpack we've seen since 1985 or '86," Phil Morrisey, hydrologist with the U.S. Natural Resources Conservation Service, said Thursday.

Roughly half of the snow-accumulation season has passed.

"During the last week, there's been quite a lot of snow in the central mountains," Morrisey said in a telephone interview.

The sudden surfeit of snow is due, in large part, to a strong jet stream, said Dan Borsum, National Weather Service forecaster in Boise.

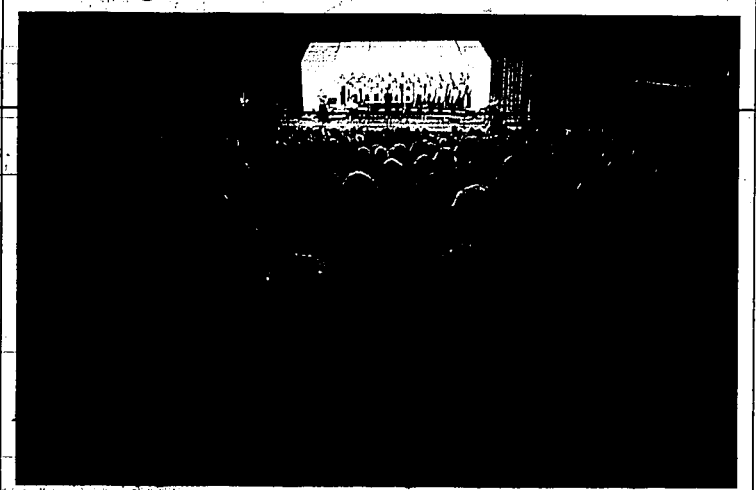
spills into a northern and a southern stream - with southern Idaho left high and dry in the middle, he said.

"But it's one strong flow across, and it's just throwing the moisture in the Western states," Borsum said.

The latest storm cycle got started around the first of the year, "and has pretty well pummeled us ever since," he added.

Death toll tops 4,000 in Japan

KOBE, Japan - Swiss rescue dogs led search teams to more entombed bodies Thursday as the earthquake death toll swelled past 4,000.

New fires burst out around the shattered city, and firefighters' efforts to douse them were stymied by crushed water mains.

short of victims' needs, thousands more gave up hope of finding food and shelter and joined the stream of residents abandoning the city on foot.

By early today, confirmed deaths totaled 4,047, making Tuesday's 7.2-magnitude earthquake the worst in Japan in more than 70 years.

Another 727 people were still unaccounted for, and freezing temperatures made relatives more desperate about finding missing friends or family members alive.

In one Kobe neighborhood, a barking pet dog led rescuers to his owner, 65-year-old Chiyoko Amakawa, who had been buried for 53 hours.

"It was pitch dark and my leg hurt so much and I was thirsty, but I called to 'Pochi' and told him I was in pain and needed help," Amakawa told Kyodo.

Suspect wants to call 'Larkin the Executor'

TWIN FALLS - A Colorado man wants to be hypnotized in court so he can testify on behalf of a 300-year-old warrior who purportedly witnessed an attack on the man's former girlfriend.

Jack Peel, 48, acting as his own attorney, is seeking to summon the spirit of the warrior "Larkin the Executor" to testify in court.

Peel's former girlfriend, Connie Price, testified in October that Peel woke her up with a "hand over my mouth and a gun to my head" on Sept. 25.

Beast of Bodmin lives, but what is it?

BODMIN MOOR, England - Children who live on a moor scoured by wind and water in England's southwest don't believe in Scotland's Loch Ness monster.

But they're sure the Beast of Bodmin Moor is for real.

"Something lives on the moor. People have seen it with their own eyes," said 10-year-old Darren Sewin.

One of those who swears he's seen the creature is Darren's classmate, Ross Kemp, also 10. The beast, he said, is big and black and a little scary.

In a hunt that recalls the Sherlock Holmes adventure, "The Hound of the Baskervilles," the government agreed last week to spend \$13,000 to investigate the possible existence of one or more wild catlike animals on Bodmin Moor.

Government zoologists will be sent out to check on local claims that the wild cats have been mauling livestock and frightening children.

Legend holds that King Arthur threw his sword Excalibur into Dozmary Pool on the moor.

For more than four years, Rosemary Rhodes, 36, has tried to persuade others that wild cats live on Bodmin Moor and are responsible for savagely killing farm animals.

"I've been called, a hysterical, menopausal, attention-seeking female," she said.

Gesturing across a broad expanse of drab land, Rhodes said she is unconcerned that more people haven't seen the beast.

In what she admits has become an obsession, she and friend Don Rogers often go out after midnight with a powerful light plugged into the battery of her

Book not closed on Gingrich deal

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attack on his backers, Newt Gingrich accused Democrats Thursday of seeking his "personal destruction."

A Republican ally warned that the assault on the House speaker's book contract could jeopardize passage of President Clinton's bill to rescue Mexico's economy.

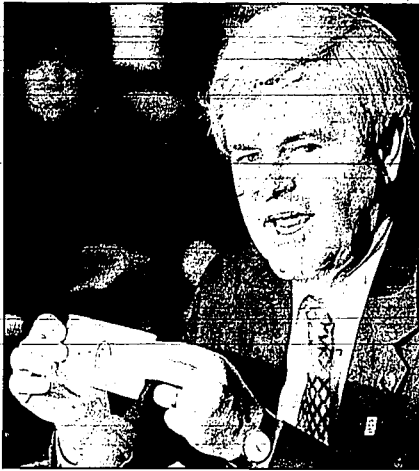
"In this setting, comity on controversial legislation is difficult to obtain," House Banking Committee Chairman Jim Leach, R-Iowa, wrote the White House in a politely worded note that injected domestic political controversy into the world of international finance.

If anything, Democrats sharpened their criticism of the man whose political acumen helped engineer last fall's GOP election sweep. "It makes every member of the House look like a money-grubber," Rep. David Obey of Wisconsin said of Gingrich's contract that initially would have paid him \$4.5 million advance.

Ironically, the developments came on a day when Gingrich and Democratic Leader Richard Gephardt of Missouri met to discuss appointment of members to the House ethics committee. The panel could investigate allegations that improper tax deductible contributions were made to finance a college course taught by Gingrich and questions about his book deal with a company owned by media magnate Rupert Murdoch.

After meeting for an hour, neither Gephardt nor Gingrich would comment. Appointment of the panel has been an awkward affair as speaker, Gingrich has the power to name the panel's GOP members, who might then have to turn around and investigate him.

Tensions boiled over on the House floor Wednesday, when Democrats attacked the book contract and

Republicans sprang to Gingrich's defense. On a party line vote, the GOP struck from the Congressional Record comments made by Rep. Carrie Meek, D-Fla.

Leach's note to White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta, dated Wednesday and obtained from congressional sources, touched directly on the controversy.

With the proposed Mexican bailout legislation buffeted by criticism, Leach wrote, "The atmospheres have gone from bad to worse. In the wake of White House attacks on the speaker this weekend, House Democrats launched ad hominem criticisms of the speaker today. In this setting, comity on controversial legislation is difficult to obtain."

He added: "Nevertheless, there is still some prospect of early consideration of the bill, which at the moment reflects extraordinary

accommodation with the administration."

Gingrich has strongly proclaimed his innocence of any wrongdoing and moved earlier to defuse the book controversy by renouncing a \$4.5 million advance he had won from HarperCollins, the publishing house owned by Murdoch.

At a news conference, he held a \$1 bill aloft and said that was the extent of his advance. He defended anew a Nov. 28 meeting with Murdoch, who is involved in an ownership dispute before the FCC involving his Fox TV network. "There was a courtesy call. I don't recollect any discussion at all about legislation and, in fact, the Rupert Murdoch position is he doesn't need legislation" to resolve the dispute, Gingrich said.

"I expect Democrats to take every shot they can get," said Gingrich, known for his ferocious attacks on Democrats in the past. He also noted a newspaper column saying Democrats had a strategy to destroy him. "I think a strategy based on the personal destruction of somebody is pretty amazing. If it is a genuine strategy. Not looking at issues, not looking at facts, but having a strategy of personal destruction, I find pretty sobering in America."

Ironically, Murdoch was in the Capitol during the day, one of the invited participants at a closed-door session with Republican lawmakers working on telecommunications legislation. Murdoch left the session without talking to reporters. He was invited to a dinner several hours later where Gingrich was to be the featured speaker.

Republicans insisted the controversy surrounding Gingrich wasn't hampering their attempts to enact an ambitious "Contract With America" agenda featuring tax and spending cuts.

Lawmakers eye ban on aid for disabled

WASHINGTON (AP) — Joanne Spencer spends her sons' disability check on the electric bills that keep Joshua's feeding pump whirring through the night and repair to the portable computer that is David's only form of communication.

Without Supplemental Security Income, Spencer says she couldn't care for two sons with cerebral palsy at home and work part-time, earning the money she needs to support a third son in college.

But lawmakers say the \$4.5 billion SSI child disability program has grown out of control. They want to abolish cash payments to 887,000 disabled children, many with chronic illnesses or life-threatening diseases, who live in low-income families.

Legislation being drafted by Reps. Jim McCrery, R-La., and Jerry Kleczka, D-Wis., would replace SSI payments to children — but not the payments that disabled adults receive — with expanded medical care under Medicaid, which children would continue to receive. Things like wheelchair ramps, psychiatric services or respite care, could be provided under the proposed plan.

Parents say they spend their children's SSI checks on items that would not necessarily be covered: for transportation to doctors appointments, for electric bills, which are high because they are running feeding pumps or air conditioners or humidifiers, or for special clothing.

McCrery and Kleczka also want to tighten the definition of childhood disability, saying current law allows children who are not truly disabled to collect a monthly federal benefit averaging \$412.

Kleczka said the system encourages parents to have their children classified as disabled and discourages treatment because a successful recovery means that benefits end.

The number of children who receive SSI tripled in the past four years, since a 1990 Supreme Court ruling and new regulations liberalized the rules. The cost of the program nearly quadrupled.

Educators and lawmakers claim parents abuse the program by coaching their children to misbehave in school, fail tests, or "act crazy" to qualify for benefits. Children with mental impairments account for more than two-thirds of the recent growth, according to the General Accounting Office.

Parents of severely disabled children say loss of cash benefits under the proposed SSI overhaul, which may become part of legislation to reform the welfare system, could force families to put their children in institutions.

Jim Farris of Milwaukee, whose 2 1/2-year-old daughter Stephanie has cerebral palsy, uses SSI to buy the formula that is fed to her through a tube in her stomach, and for the 10 to 11 diapers she uses every day and will probably need for the rest of her life.

Connie Wells' teen-age daughter, Janell, needs insulate, underwax, jogging suits, humidifiers, skin creams, and a heated waterbed to cope with a disorder that affects her heart rate, breathing and body temperature.

"Don't take away the only thing we have, that we can use in a flexible manner, to meet all these diverse needs of our kids," said Mrs. Wells of Tallahassee, Fla. "Our homes are not hospitals."

Spencer, a divorced mother in Brockton, Mass., said SSI "has made it possible for me to keep our family together."

David, 20, and Joshua, 16, have seizure disorders as well as cerebral palsy. David uses a computer to communicate and has severe behavior problems such as being physically aggressive. Joshua has asthma and is in a wheelchair.

"I wish with all my heart I didn't have to take this money," Spencer said. "We're seeing so many reports on the problems with SSI, of families buying swimming pools and VCRs. But that's not what most of us use it for. I use it to give the kids the things they need to keep them at home."

Court: Black couple may deserve hearing

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — A black couple who sued over an auto accident deserves a new trial if they can prove jurors made racist jokes during deliberations, Florida's Supreme Court ruled Thursday.

"It is not by chance that the words 'Equal Justice Under Law' have been placed for all to see above the entrance to this nation's highest court," Justice Harry Lee Anstead wrote for the unanimous court.

Researcher: MIAs died in captivity

HANOI, Vietnam (AP) — Hundreds of U.S. servicemen were killed in captivity during the Vietnam War, mostly in the heart of battle but some from torture, according to an American researcher who had rare access to Hanoi's war archives.

Theodore Schweitzer said Thursday four years of studying Vietnamese documents and interviewing officials convinced him Hanoi did not hold back prisoners in 1973, when the U.S. pulled out of the war.

After the Paris peace accords, Hanoi returned nearly 600 American POWs but the fate of many others remained a mystery. Speculation that Hanoi kept some as hostages or slave labor persists even today.

The United States still lists 1,621 as missing in action. Although the two countries are about to open liaison offices in each other's capitals,

Washington says Hanoi must cooperate fully in clarifying the fate of the missing before full diplomatic relations can be established.

A just-published book, "Inside Hanoi's Secret Archives: Solving the MIA Mystery," written by Malcolm McConnell on the basis of Schweitzer's research, argues that American prisoners who didn't come back died in captivity.

Some were killed while resisting their captors or trying to escape, the book quotes a senior Vietnamese colonel, Pham Duk Dai, as telling Schweitzer.

Others were executed because they

were too badly wounded to be moved, or were beaten to death by angry peasants in areas heavily bombed by the Americans. Still others died in U.S. raids on the Communist units that held them, Dai was quoted as saying.

One of the most dramatic passages of the book is a quote from the second officer, identified by the apparent pseudonym of Lt. Col. Nguyen Van Thi. "We killed many American prisoners in cold blood. They were tortured to death in prison, or simply killed outright from fear they would try to escape." This is quoted as saying.

Pilot returns to duty in South Korea

WASHINGTON — Chief Warrant Officer Bobby Hall, the helicopter pilot who was shot down by North Korean forces last month, will return to his Army unit in South Korea next week, the Defense Department said Thursday.

Hall was shot down with co-pilot Chief Warrant Officer David Hilemon on Dec. 17 after straying across the Demilitarized Zone into North Korean air space. Hilemon died in the incident. Hall was uninjured and held captive for 13 days.

Pentagon spokesman Kenneth Bacon said Hall would resume his pilot duties.

Enola Gay exhibit irks American Legion

WASHINGTON — The American Legion demanded Thursday that the Smithsonian Institution cancel an exhibit of the plane that dropped the atomic bomb on Japan, charging that despite five revisions it still portrayed the United States as the aggressor.

The Smithsonian had no comment. A spokesman declined to say if the exhibit would be canceled.

The exhibit would be the first public showing of the B-29, the Enola Gay, and would commemorate the 50th anniversary of the bombing of Nagasaki and Hiroshima, which claimed 210,000 lives.

It was to have opened in May at the National Air and Space Museum, one of the most popular tourist stops in Washington.

Official pushes slowing cuts at HUD

WASHINGTON — Eliminating the Department of Housing and Urban Development — or lopping off major parts that don't work — would not undo long-term contracts that are pushing costs up, its inspector general said Thursday.

HUD Inspector General Susan Gaffney told a Senate appropriations subcommittee that the department is too complicated to quickly break down into large pieces, as proposed under a plan by Secretary Henry Cisneros. Binding, long-term contracts permeate HUD's rental assistance programs, she said, and those contracts would endure even if the programs that created them are eliminated.

Study: Elephants face further decline

WASHINGTON — More than four years into a worldwide ban on the ivory trade, poaching and other illegal activity are again increasing, and the African elephant faces further decline, researchers say.

The study released Thursday by U.N., U.S. and private wildlife agencies cites what it says are alarming reductions in spending by African countries to protect elephants. It also notes growing stockpiles of government-held ivory and increasing conflict between humans and elephants across the continent.

People are killing more elephants, and there are more reports of elephants killing people in an escalating battle that the mighty mammal appears sure to lose, the study said. "Considering the elephant-human conflicts, the growing human population and the general degradation of habitat across Africa, we are never going to have full recovery of the elephant population," said Ginette Hemley, an official of World Wildlife Fund, which participated in the study.

Molestation allegations files missing

COLUMBIA, S.C. — A 1988 file detailing molestation allegations made by Susan V. Smith, the woman accused of drowning her two young sons, disappeared years ago and may have been stolen, officials said.

The file itself, an index card on the file and log book pages bearing entries from that time period all have been missing for at least two years from the Union County office of the state Department of Social Services. In 1988, when she was 16, Mrs. Smith alleged that her stepfather, Beverly Russell, molested her. No charges were ever filed against Russell, a stockbroker and tax consultant.

Clinton seeks to delay harassment case

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — President Clinton's lawyers say a federal judge should not make any more rulings in Paula Jones' sexual harassment suit because key elements are on appeal.

While postponing the trial until Clinton leaves office, U.S. District Judge Susan Webber Wright ruled on Dec. 28 that fact-finding procedures such as taking sworn statements from witnesses could proceed.

Both sides have appealed to the 8th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in St. Louis; Clinton to ask that all action be delayed. Ms. Jones to ask that the trial go on and that Clinton not be allowed to delay his response to her suit. Jones filed her appeal Tuesday.

Senators hear mixed word on military

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Republican-led committee heard testimony Thursday that a widely reported military readiness problem is less serious than reported — but could get much worse.

Even though mid-level officers from each of the four service branches, told the Senate Armed Service Committee of overwork, delayed repairs and idle equipment, top administration officials insisted they have the situation under control.

But they also warned that the readiness could deteriorate if they don't get a cash infusion soon.

Adm. William Owens, vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, said balancing the day-to-day needs of the military with the requirements of building for a more modern force in the future is difficult and subjective.

But Owens added, "We are satisfied that given the deck of cards that we have been given — the money we've been given to spend ... that this balance is about right."

Owens displayed a chart indicating that preparedness for battle in the Army, Navy, Air Force and Marines has remained the same or improved slightly over the past decade.

Republicans, however, said President Clinton is overusing the military on missions unrelated to vital national security such as responding to the crisis in Rwanda, occupying Haiti and handling refugees in Panama.

"The pace at which all the services are now operating exceeds the pace of operations at the height of the Cold War, yet they are being funded at lower levels," said Sen.

Strom Thurmond, R-S.C., the committee chairman.

Sen. John Warner, R-Va., the second-ranking Republican on the panel, said overseas missions have forced the administration to dip into funds intended for training, equipment, ammunition and fuel.

"That's been the cookie jar into which our hand has dipped to send our troops here, there and everywhere," Warner said.

Indeed, Cmdr. James Stavridis, a Navy ship captain who testified Thursday, said the crew of his destroyer, the USS John Barry, has been at sea 75 percent of the time over the past two years. He said he fears his crewmen, tired of being separated from their families, "will vote with their feet and leave the Navy."

And Army Maj. Gen. Douglas Buchholz, who commands a communications training operation at Fort Gordon, Ga., said he has a \$2.5 million communications simulator

that sits idle because of a lack of funds to run it. The result is that he sends signal officers into the field untrained on the equipment they will be asked to use.

Owens suggested that the concern generated last fall when three of the Army's 12 paratrooper divisions were raised below par in readiness may have been excessive. Two of those divisions, he said, are to be deactivated this spring.

The third would be the last to deploy in a war situation and its readiness ratings will be restored in a matter of months.

But the Pentagon's top budget planner, John Hamre, told the committee that Congress must quickly approve a \$2.6 billion emergency supplemental defense budget request that Clinton will send to Capitol Hill on Feb. 6.

Without that money, Hamre said, the military will have to cut back drastically on training and other operations.

Report cites Peace Corps problems in former East Bloc

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the rush to help emerging democracies after the demise of the East Bloc, the Peace Corps devised programs that were inefficient, poorly supervised and often ineffective, congressional investigators say.

Peace Corps volunteers had poor language training and insufficient housing and financial support. Their

technical skills — in many cases involving advanced degrees in accounting, law or business — "had little relevance to their assignments," according to a study by the Congressional General Accounting Office.

Many staff members assigned to supervise volunteers in each country, "had little knowledge of the local language and culture before

they arrived, which they said significantly hindered their effectiveness," said the report based on a review conducted through July 1994.

For example, volunteers who were trained in Russian and Uzbek language were sent to cities in Uzbekistan where Tajik language is spoken.

Peace Corps officials said the

problems came as a result of a fast start up, bypassing standard procedures. The agency rushed volunteers in following the unravelling of the Soviet empire in 1989.

Because those countries had been isolated from the West for so many years, cultural unfamiliarity was a problem, said Peace Corps director Carol Bellamy.

Housing officials debate area problems

BURLEY — Providing housing for migrant farm workers in the Mini-Cassia area has been hampered by a lack of coordinated efforts and a lack of commitment from farmers, an official said Thursday.

Nearly 30 officials from the two counties met Thursday morning to discuss issues facing the area. A business incubator, recycling, and comprehensive plans also were on the agenda.

Joseph L. Herring, executive director of the Region IV Development Association Inc., told Mini-Cassia elected officials that the development association has many tools, including grants, to help the counties come up with migrant housing, but that funding needs to come first.

"The problem in the Mini-Cassia area is a lack of commitment from the growers associations, it has been very poor," he said. "Funding is not in place, because there is no local commitment."

The Cassia County Farm Labor Camp south of Burley has been put up for sale this month. Repairing and upgrading the camp to meet federal health and safety regulations would have cost more than the camp owners could afford, the camp manager said.

The camp, which housed about 200 migrants, is owned by the Cassia County Labor Association, a group of beet farmers.

On another topic, Herring also told officials that the area could support a business incubator.

A small business incubator provides a controlled environment for new businesses, Herring said. The College of Southern Idaho in Twin Falls has an incubator that cost \$1.4 million. It was funded by a \$780,000 grant from the Economic Development Administration, \$100,000 each from local businesses and the city. CSI picked up the rest of the tab, he said.

Most businesses have a product, but they don't know how to start a business, Herring explained. An incubator provides office space, instruction and

resources such as copy machines, he said. CSI President Jerry Meyerhoeffer is interested in starting an incubator at the Mini-Cassia center, Herring said.

Terry Schultz, director of Southern Idaho Regional Solid Waste District, said he wants to secure officials' support for recycling programs.

He said the agency wants to expand its compost recycling program, now in its second year. Its goal is to distribute 1,000 compost containers throughout southern Idaho this year, he said.

"Our goal is to get yard waste out of the waste stream," he said.

The agency also wants to start a community recycling program this spring that would provide drop-off points for tin, aluminum, newspaper and mixed paper, Schultz said.

He said that because markets for recyclable waste have improved, the agency, which handles recycling in Blaine County, should start returning by spring between \$2,000 and \$3,000 a month to the county.

Minidoka County Commissioner John Rensberg urged his colleagues to

consider working together on comprehensive plans. The group agreed to set up a meeting time and hash it out.

Rensberg said he is concerned that people need to understand the implications of expanding impact areas and establishing zoning ordinances.

An example would be a small city, such as Heyburn, that wants to expand its impact area. Those in outlying areas would be subject to city regulations when their interests may be different, Rensberg explained.

"If you have an area like north Burley or east of Heyburn that's going to be developed, the community should have input on how they feel that development should take place," he said. Cassia County Commissioner John Adams said Cassia is open to any discussion, however, getting people from cities with different identities to work together could be difficult.

"The out lying areas don't think like the city," he said.

Utah man accused of stealing car

The boy told a school bus driver who was dropping off his brother what was happening. The driver took the boys to a neighbor's house, Jeffries said.

The man surrendered to police without incident, Jeffries said. He was arrested on a Bannock County probation violation, he said.

Sheriff's deputies first were alerted that something was afoot when they received a report of a vehicle fire at Gifford Springs. Power County received a report of a man walking on the frozen river toward American Falls, Jeffries said. Apparently he had walked about three miles to the boat house, Jeffries said.

The man could face second degree arson charges in Cassia County, Lt. Alan Smith of the Cassia County Sheriff's Department. The man could also face unlawful entry charges in Power County, Jeffries said, though the boy did let him inside the home.

Cassia officials find 6 dogs poisoned in Declo

DECLO — Six dogs that apparently were poisoned have been found in or near Kiwanis Park since Sunday.

The latest, a 6-month-old puppy, was found Thursday.

Cassia County Sheriff's Department received a report Wednesday from Declo resident Susan Cox. She said her pit bull was found dead Monday morning behind her family's camping trailer with bloodshot eyes and foam at the mouth, according to a police report.

Cox told investigating Deputy Larry L. Thompson that several dead dogs and cats have been found in the area, the report said.

Thompson learned that three dogs were found in Kiwanis Park on Tuesday, all of which reportedly had foamed at the mouth, the report said. The poison appears to work fast, between one to four hours and the

dogs appear to go into convulsions and foam at the mouth, the report said.

Declo resident Kevin Mangum told Thompson a neighbor saw his golden retriever rolling on its back in convulsions and foaming at the mouth, the report said.

A veterinarian said the dogs could have been poisoned with cyanide, but other poisons cause similar signs, the report said.

Lt. Jim Hignis said bones, such as from a post roast, found in the park are being tested.

"We found it odd that they would be in the park," Hignis said. Hignis said Declo Elementary School, which is near the park, has been advised to caution children to stay away from dogs foaming at the mouth.







Toddler killed on firewood outing

COEUR D'ALENE — A 3-year-old boy was killed while his family was cutting firewood.

Kenneth Kadoun, Coeur d'Alene, was pronounced dead at Kootenai Medical Center after being run over by a family friend's pickup near Ohio Match Road and Hayden Creek. Larry Kinsey, Hayden Lake, was driving the pickup Wednesday.

Though the Kootenai County Sheriff's Department is still investigating Kadoun's death, Lt. Ben Wolfinger said the boy was playing on a hill near where his father and friends were pulling cut logs with a pickup. The boy fell under the truck's wheels, according to police reports.

Man pleads guilty to manslaughter

COEUR D'ALENE — A Kirkland, Wash. man has pleaded guilty in 1st District Court to vehicular manslaughter.

Randall Charles Hurt, 29, admitted criminal responsibility for his part in a two-vehicle accident that took the life of a 78-year-old Bayview man.

Prosecutor Bill Douglas recommended a prison sentence of two to three years.

District Judge Gary Haman said he will not be bound by the agreement. If the judge decides at the sentencing date that he cannot accept the sentencing recommendations, Haman will allow Hurt to withdraw his plea.

Man pleads innocent in shooting

COEUR D'ALENE — Daniel Buckley has pleaded innocent to an attempted-murder charge in 1st District Court.

Buckley, 29, Post Falls, is accused of shooting Michael Bymes of Coeur d'Alene in the neck with a high-powered hunting rifle.

Buckley has been in custody since the Dec. 10 shooting.

District Judge Gary Haman scheduled a 3-day trial to begin June 17.

The maximum penalty for attempted murder is 30 years in prison and a \$25,000 fine.

Buckley also faces a felony charge of witness tampering for alleged death threats he made by telephone from his jail cell to Bymes and his wife.

Gun incident throws scare into school

COEUR D'ALENE — School officials at Lake City High School got a brief scare over a handgun that police now believe was a toy.

A student reported he saw a male juvenile with a gun under his jacket Tuesday. The suspect told the student he had to take care of some "unfinished business" with another student.

The suspect and a female, both 16, were not students, said police Capt. Carl Bergh. A security guard told them to leave, but the male ran past.

The security guard found the male suspect and brought him to the school office where officials asked to search him.

He refused to be searched and ran out of the building. The pair left the school grounds in a yellow Volkswagen. Police were able to identify the suspect's license plate number.

Rocker Paul Revere pays back-taxes

BOISE — He was probably the only property tax delinquent to sign autographs as he paid his bill.

Paul Revere, of Paul Revere and the Raiders fame, arrived at the Ada County Treasurer's office Wednesday armed with cash and decked out in colonial stage garb and his black, feather-trimmed three-cornered hat.

"Just so there's no mistake — I'm paying my bill!" said Revere, who missed his payment three years ago on a 3,000-square-foot parcel of land in Boise. The original bill of \$9.91 was \$533, with late charges.

Minutes before Revere was due on a plane bound for Hawaii, he showed up at the treasurer's office, \$10 bill in hand to cover the original tax charge.

Boise settles with man hit by police car

BOISE — A 40-year-old homeless man who was run over by a Boise police car in June now has something to show for it other than a sore back.

Tom James received a \$29,000 settlement from the city of Boise. He might get more this spring if he's successful in a claim against Ada County 911 dispatchers claiming they did not adequately explain to police that James was lying in the street.

The city money will not make James rich. Most of the settlement will be used to pay off attorney fees and hospital bills. James might be left with a few thousand dollars.

"I would like to rent a house or an apartment," James said. James now is staying with a friend and trying to find a job. The incident started when James was on the street.

Superheroes draw child-care concerns

BOISE — The Downtown Child Development Center has requested that children not be allowed to wear clothing or bring toys, books or other items depicting super heroes to the center.

"Unless you have spent 11 hours with a group of young children who believe they are Power Rangers, you have yet to experience aggression at its full-blown finest," said Cathy Stout, administrative director of the center, in a letter to parents.

"After Christmas it was very apparent which children had received Power Ranger toys. Those kids were doing kick-spins, hitting each other and using verbiage from the show," Director Cindy Esposito said.

Esposito said she sees children who think solving a problem means having a "false hero" show up to avenge you.

It once was the headquarters of the FBI's Montana force, but that changed in 1989 when operations were consolidated in Salt Lake City.

The FBI plans to have another agent assigned to its Helena office by the end of March to handle FBI matters in Butte, said Galt Evans, assistant special agent in charge at the division office in Utah.

BOISE — Second-grader Nick Linn understands the benefits of his experimental class at Garfield Elementary School even though he is only 7 years old.

Nick is one of a handful of Boise and Meridian students taking part in an effort to improve education that has roots in the one-room schoolhouse.

Elementary in Meridian have removed the barriers that divide students by grade and age. Nick's class places first-graders through third-graders in one room.


The mixed group requires a new way of teaching and evaluating students.

Children progress according to their own abilities.

Teachers keep track of students

individually and teach them skills at their own pace. In this classroom, a first-grader might work on third-grade math and first-grade writing skills.

'Higher Learning': Boys with the hoods

With "Higher Learning," John Singleton, who made mean streets so memorable in "Boyz n the Hood," goes to college. And now he seems to be following two schools of thought about how to deliver his movie's central lesson.

Movie review

Singleton's third film (his sophomore effort was "Poetic Justice") is ambitious, thoughtful and more than a little schizoid. It first set expertly juggles a large ensemble for an affecting and understanding look at the emotional upheavals and uncertainties anyone experiences during freshman year. But after provocatively exploring the gray areas in the issues he raises, Singleton settles for a contrived and melodramatic collision of black and white that belongs in another and lesser picture.

The freshman class that gathers for the first semester at Columbus University represents a dizzying range of attitudes, races and classes. Singleton excels at getting the best from young actors and actresses, and he builds the splendid ensemble of "Higher Learning" on a painful irony. Here in this most politically correct of places, where the words "tolerance" and "diversity" are turned into mantras, the divisions between races and sexes are even more marked.

While Malik struggles academically and is goaded by Fishburne's Professor Phipps, Kristen becomes the victim of a drunken date rape. In the aftermath of this horrible experience, she is torn between a new boyfriend and a compassionate lesbian. Meanwhile, Remy drifts into the company of the skinhead clique at the school and embraces their crude racism and violent ways.

Fishburne, who seems destined to become the recurring father figure in Singleton's movies, puffs on his pipe, hands out peppermints and delivers his homilies in a Jamaican accent. It is somewhat thankless work and he does it well for as long as Singleton is content to keep the film rooted in the middle ground. When Remy lapses into deepening derangement, rhetoric supplants meaningful dialogue. Unfortunately, the same changes ultimately overwhelm "Higher Learning." (Twin Cinema)

Micron stock rises to new high after quake

BOISE — Computer chip prices went up 3 percent and Micron Technology Inc. stock soared to a new high Tuesday on fears the earthquake in Japan will interrupt production of chips.

The Kyoto-Osaka-Kobe area is home to about a dozen chip factories, said Dan Kleksen, an analyst at Robertson, Stephens and Co. in San Francisco.

But it was unclear how many factories halted production because of earthquake damage.

A factory owned by Texas Instruments Inc. and Kobe Steel was shut down after equipment shifted during the quake.

Kleksen said an NEC Corp. plant had shut down. NEC is Japan's biggest semiconductor manufacturer.

The interruptions will put more price pressure on already tight supplies of chips, industry experts said.

"The impact... would be less supply in the market," Micron spokesman Kim Bedard said. "With supply and demand like they are now, that would continue to keep those two tight."

Trade deficit worsens, approaches record level

WASHINGTON — Despite the Clinton administration's aggressive campaign for trade agreements, America's trade deficit is worsening and on track toward a record exceeding \$150 billion for 1994.

The Commerce Department reported Thursday the deficit in November climbed 4.3 percent to \$10.53 billion, up from a revised \$10.10 billion in October.

U.S. exports of goods and services, helped by a giant surge in sales of commercial airliners, were

up 2.2 percent to a record \$61.16 billion.

But imports climbed at an even faster pace of 2.5 percent to \$71.69 billion, the seventh straight month they have hit a new high. The gain in November reflected in part a higher foreign oil bill and more imports of autos. The trade gap is the difference between imports and exports.

The Clinton administration, which counts among its greatest achievements a round of market-opening trade agreements, blamed the deteriorating trade performance on unequal economic growth rates among America's major trading partners.

"On the goods news, we have an economic recovery continues. That puts American consumers in a position to purchase goods from abroad. The bad news is other economies are not performing as well," said White House press secretary Mike McCurry.

But some private economists contend that major trade barriers, especially in Japan and China, were to blame as well. Despite several market-opening agreements, the United States has been unable to strike a deal with Japan on autos and auto parts, which account for nearly two-thirds of the deficit with Japan.

One-time rock

McGraw, McBride to headline '95 Twin Falls County Fair

FILER — In show business, timing is everything.

So Twin Falls County Fair manager Cindy Demoney admitted doing some exuberant boot scoot'n' when she found out that the fair's agents had booked as next summer's headline acts.

"Our theme this year is going to be 'Down on the Farm,'" Demoney said Thursday. "Then we found out they signed Tim McGraw."

"If you don't associate McGraw with farming, then you've been playing Vivaldi on your radio lately."

"Down on the Farm" spent eight weeks on the Billboard country charts last summer, two-stepping with Alan Jackson's "Summertime Blues" for the No. 1 spot.

"He was No. 1 on the country charts again last week," Demoney said. "That's about as good as a small-town fair gets."

McGraw will appear with singer Martina McBride ("Independence Day," "My Baby Loves Me") in two shows, at 6:30 p.m. and 9 p.m., on Sunday, Sept. 3. The tab for their fees and production will cost the fair board between \$55,000 and \$60,000, Demoney said.



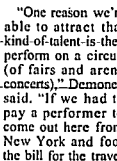

would get pretty expensive. Singer Mark Chesnut's single performance in Filer last September sold out, as did Tanya Tucker's the year before.

"It'll be the same format as last year," Demoney said. "We'll have standing room-only tickets available."

McGraw, who's 27, and McBride, 28, will be the youngest headliners in the fair's history, and like Chesnut, part of the emerging country music school that traces its roots to a hybrid of Texas swing and bluegrass and the rock-flavored anthems of the Eagles and Pure Prairie League.

"I made up my mind after my first year in college that I was gonna teach myself to play guitar," McGraw told an interviewer recently. "That was all I thought about. I

ate and slept country music." McGraw, who is the son of former New York Mets and Philadelphia Phillies pitcher Tug McGraw, dropped out of Northeast Louisiana University in 1989 and bought a bus ticket to Nashville, Tenn.

"It wasn't exactly a job, but I got to get up and sing at Skull's Rainbow Room in Printer's Alley," he said. "That is where I got to cut my teeth. That is where I sang every night for about a year and a half."

A friend from Louisiana lent him enough money to cut a demo record, and got a little-known session musician named Joe Diffie to sing harmony. McGraw took the tape to Nashville's Curb Records, and the label signed him in 1990. Less than two years later, he was on the Billboard charts with "Welcome to the Club."

After touring with Diffie, Sawyer Brown, Dwight Yoakam and Wynonna, McGraw released the album "Not a Moment Too Soon" early in 1994. A cut on that album, "Indian Outlaw," topped the country charts



and cracked the pop Top 20. "Not a Moment Too Soon" has since gone triple-platinum, and the title cut was No. 1 for two weeks; it's No. 4 this week.

"I honestly never thought that something like this would happen," McGraw said. "I just hoped. You think you might have some success because otherwise you wouldn't get into the business. But when you're from a small town and you hear those guys on the radio, it seems like that is just a whole 'nother world."

The Kansas-born McBride, a protégé of Brook Brooks, was selling T-shirts on Brooks' tours when RCA producers heard her demo tape in 1991. She opened for Brooks on his 1992 tour, and released her debut album: "The Time Has Come," just two years ago this month.

Three cuts from that album made the Billboard charts, and one of them, "Independence Day," became the Country Music Association music video of the year for 1994. Her second album, "The Way That I Am," came out last year, spawning "My Baby Loves Me" and "Heart Trouble," which have both made the Top 40 Billboard country charts.

Film festival offers sample of myth, mirth

'Buddha': New Age moral play

"Little Buddha" is a dreamy, New Age fairy tale from famed director Bernardo Bertolucci. Like his earlier films ("1900," "The Last Emperor," "The Sheltering Sky"), it's sprawling, exotic and more than a little ambitious.

On one level, "Little Buddha" attempts to illustrate the Buddhist legend of Siddhartha, the sheltered prince who left his overprotective father more than 2,500 years ago to seek spiritual enlightenment. On his transcendental journey, Siddhartha fasted in the forest, encountered magical visions and was tempted by evil. In the end, he conquered the forces that would lead him astray to become the Buddha.

With typical flamboyance, Bertolucci re-creates all the metaphysical elements of this Asian myth. The result is like a gauzy, drug-induced dream. The characters wear sumptuous, flowing robes and extravagant, dangling jewelry and walk on rose petals. In one scene, a cobra slithers from the underbrush and fans itself over Siddhartha's head to protect him from the rain.

There's a risk in such an attention to detail: While many of the images are breathtaking, others, such as the cobra

scene, seem downright hokey. One reason the illusion doesn't mesh is that Bertolucci has cringingly cast Keanu Reeves ("Bill & Ted's Excellent Adventure," "Point Break") as the mystical Asian prince. Welcome back, Señor Kotter

The advancing years must be mellowing Italian director Lina Wertmuller, now 65, because her latest film, "Ciao, Professor!" is decidedly more modest and conventional than many of her previous ones.

Its tone is quiet and its plot exceedingly simple, a variation on the tried-and-true tale of a teacher grappling with unruly students. He educates them, but they educate him just as much.

Everyone's ennobled in the end. But if that sounds depressingly like an episode of "Welcome Back, Kotter," rest assured that Wertmuller brings some of her typical panache to the yarn, uses it to make a number of compelling social observations and imbues it with additional tensions, such as the warring sensibilities of northern and southern Italians.

The teacher, Matteo Sperelli, hails from the North but lands in the South due to a computer error at a placement office. Wisely, Wertmuller doesn't belabor this plot device, which is close to becoming hackneyed, but quickly sets about depicting her protagonist's acclimation to a new environment. It's a place populated by low-key eccentrics, including an aged and addled

widow in the building where he resides. She continually mistakes him for her late husband, nagging him about whether he remembered to bring mozzarella home.

The most quizzical people are those who run his new school, and they don't run it very well at all. In fact, only a handful of his students even show up for class on Sperelli's first day. Using them as guides, he combs the streets for the missing kids and hauls them by the collar into school.

'The Mask' shows up in video stores

"The Mask" (PG-13). A free-wheeling take on the old story of the mouse who turns into a lion, "The Mask" is a live-action cartoon that takes its plot from the work of animators Chuck Jones and especially Tex Avery.

In his first film since the unexpected bonanza of "Ace Ventura," Jim Carrey displays the rubbery physical skills and startling shifts of demeanor that make him the perfect performer for this kind of material. And Industrial Light & Magic has come up with some bizarrely funny effects that blend seamlessly with the live-action material.

But while there are plenty of giddily funny moments throughout this movie, which so ardently aims to please, it never delivers on its early promise. Partly that's because most of what's on screen already has been done in those compact seven-minute bursts of cartoon craziness that Jones (at Warner Bros.) and Avery (at Warner Bros. and MGM) did so well for decades.

There's a novelty thrill to seeing a real actor's eyes jump out of his head or his limbs stretch out like elastic bands, but like all novelties, the more it is repeated, the more it needs freshening.

Carrey plays Stanley Ipkiss, a meek but nice bank officer given to tongue-tied bouts of nervousness around women. One night, on his way home after dispiriting failure to get into a nightclub to see sexy singer Tina Carlyle (Cameron Diaz), he fishes a wooden mask out of a river. He puts it on and it suddenly turns green and conforms skin-tight to his face.

As he twirls madly, his dull duds are transformed into a '40s zoot suit. But most of all, he comes in for a severe attitude adjustment, his retiring politeness replaced by aggressive self-assertion.

The effects, as virtuosic as they are, are faded by Stanley's transformation into the live actor, romancing Carlyle and Carrey's uninhibited behavior that really makes them work. Stanley's idiosyncratic collection of ties and accessories have provided a comically sure set-up for this moment when the wild man within is released from the last of his restraints.

But it's slowly downhill from there. Particularly disappointing is a scene where, when he's suddenly made out of a policeman. The Mask goes into a performance of an old Desi Arnaz hit, "Cuban Pete," (Carrey even sounds a bit like Arnaz) that ends with Carrey leading a conga line of bedazzled cops. The music is too lively and Carrey too impressive for the scene to be a complete wash, but it has been assembled in a muddled jumble.

Some usually fine supporting players, including Peter Riegert as a bemused cop on Stanley's case from his opening-night transformation, and Amy Yasbeck as a reporter on the Mask beat, also drift without much focus. (Knight-Ridder Newspapers) (Video West, Blockbuster).

"Wolf" (R). This Mike Nichols film starring Jack Nicholson and Michelle Pfeiffer doesn't take a straight horror film approach to the werewolf genre, and it's not a jockey send-up either. It's something fresher and infinitely more inventive — a satire about how to climb the corporate ladder that uses werewolf lore only as its metaphorical springboard. In its own delightfully peculiar way, the film is the only one of its kind ever made — a horror film

about office politics. What Nichols has attempted here — with the assistance of screenwriters Jim Harrison and Wesley Strick — is the filmmaking equivalent of a high-wire act. The result is a sometimes shaky, always enchanting Beauty and the Beast story for grown-ups that is the very essence of smart fun — droll, sophisticated and surprisingly, pleasingly light. The movie isn't wholly great, it stuns to unravel just after the midway point. Still, there are charms enough all the way through to make it the most seductive, most enjoyable film of the summer.

Nicholson plays Will Randall, the respected senior editor of a Manhattan publishing firm — and from the look of it, this low-energy, almost depressive character with his pipe and corduroys was conceived as a sort of inverse joke on the actor's larger-than-life hipster image. At the beginning of the film, the firm is in the process of a corporate takeover and Randall is about to lose his job to a more ambitious, younger colleague (James Spader). It's not hard to see why, for all his "taste and individuality" — the qualities that takeover tycoon Raymond Allen (Christopher Plummer) praises in his distinguished employee just before giving him the boot — Randall is pretty much spent.

Nicholson — first, last and always — and it's his modulated suavity and wit that make the film so sublimely entertaining. (Washington Post) (Blockbuster, Video West)

"The Shadow" (PG-13). This movie's radio roots are showing in this static "Batman"-esque film about a Depression-era superhero who fights crime by cab. While the descendants of this, the great-grandchildren of American superheroes, literally drop in on felons, the Shadow pulls up and figures his tip. Like his super powers — invisibility and the ability to cloud men's minds — his mode of transportation seldom translates into eye-popping action.

The Shadow, played by Alec Baldwin, is billionaire playboy Lamont Cranston when he isn't on duty. When Lamont cracks open a bottle of wine, his magic cape, his nose gets bigger and then he gets into a cab driven by Peter Boyle. At the scene of dastardly deeds, the Shadow vanishes (except for his shadow) and rights wrongs, all the while laughing like a manic-depressive hyena.

The story, by "Jurassic Park's" David Koopp, pits the Shadow against Shiwan Khan (John Lone), an amiable psychotic, set by world domination. A wild threat perhaps in the Shadow's day, the scenario seems laughable given the superpowers' problems in Afghanistan and Vietnam. It's less plausible, in fact, than a theme park full of defrosted dinosaurs.

The film opens in Tibet, where Lamont is holding down a job as a ruthless opium lord known as "the butcher of Lhasa." His bohemian crimes come to the attention of the Tulku (Brendy Tantrum), a mystic who redeems Lamont's black soul, teaches him to cloud men's minds and bids him to repay his karmic debts. Though Lamont's atrocities were committed against the Tibetans, he returns to New York City to do his penance alongside his uncle (Jonathan Winters), the police commissioner.

Shortly thereafter, Shiwan Khan arrives in a silver coffin that belonged to his ancestor Genghis, from whom he inherited an attitude for which he tends to overcompensate. Also trained by the Tulku, Khan has powers that are the equal of the Shadow's. That's right — they both laugh a lot when they're

invisible. Initially the villain invites the hero to join him in his twisted quest for mastery of the planet, but Lamont, who has mastered his dark nature, declines.

Besides, he'd rather be drinking martinis at the Cobalt Club with Margo Lane (Kittenfish Penelope Ann Miller), a telepathic socialite whose father (Sir Ian McKellen) is building an atomic bomb. Margo, who can read Lamont's tormented mind, realizes that he never wants to see her

again, but the fates intervene when Khan captures her father and the two story lines collide: Sex bomb meets A-bomb in a classic but poorly staged confrontation between good and evil. Will Khan make Big Apple sauce? Or will the hero prevail? The Shadow knows, but he doesn't really seem to care. Perhaps in his heart of hearts, he longs for his days as a piligraging pseudo-Mongol. 

Tesla: Not just faces in a crowd

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Tesla singer Jeff Keith isn't one of those popular angst-ridden frontmen. Sure, he worries about the environment and animal welfare, but he loves his mama and thinks, as he says in a song from the band's new album, "Bust a Nut," that the world is wonderful.

"There's so many beautiful things in the world," Keith says. "You can sit there and let the good or the bad win over. (But) it's just a fact that there's a lot of bad things and there's still a lot of good, beautiful things. That's what keeps a person going, I think."

love, that people really appreciate... but at the same time, how can we do it without contributing to some of the things that we just feel so totally against?" "Earthquake" follows a similar line of thought.

"If I've ever gotten negative, Mom knows I'm always trying to make the outcome positive. I didn't want my mom to think that I'm so miserable (that) I'm here in this world."

Keith thinks Tesla's relatively anonymous status in the music world is "invited," which deals with missing out on the possibilities of life. It also points out that nothing is impossible, but Keith has his doubts about that.

"That's all I heard my whole life—remember, nothing's impossible. Where there's a will, there's a way," Keith said.

"But I'm a positive person. If there's even the slightest possibility, I'll say that glass is half-full, not half-empty... I'm the kind of person that when I see something that's really messed up, I want to fix it."

The band — which also includes guitarists Frank Hannon and Tommy Skooch, bassist Brian Wheat, and drummer Troy Luccketta — proudly boasts "No Machines!" on each album; no computer sequencing or keyboards for these guys.

"We've always took pride in manu-

ally playing everything, not just setting some kind of sequence thing up," Keith said. "That's just the kind of thing that when you're in the studio, you've got to think about... let's face it, we could just sit there and just overbust and overbust that's a choir or something."

"You've just always got to keep in mind that you've got to pull this off live." Tesla had a top 10 hit in 1990 with a remake of the Five Man Electrical Band song, "Signs," from the "Five Man Acoustical Jam" album. "Signs" had been a favorite of Keith's all his life, and the album was one of the first in the unplugged craze.

"It did really well and so when people go, 'That was a smart move, we've got to sit there like dummies and go.' As much as we'd like to, we can't take credit for that," he said.

"People go, 'You started a whole trend with this acoustic thing.' We just closed our eyes and tossed that arrow and it happened to hit a bull's-eye."

Less certain is the band's ability to maintain its status in the current chart climate — each one of its previous records went gold and four went platinum. Still, Keith remains positive.

"Everybody says (this) on every album they make, (but) honestly, I really think this is the best album we ever made," he said. "I love it — it's so us."

Q: Is it true that Bill Cosby blames the current dip in his TV career on racism? —G.S.

A: Bill is showing an uncharacteristic hint of discontent, even bitterness, these days.

At 57, after phenomenal success with his own hugely rated TV series, he finds that the Wednesday night NBC series "The Cosby Mysteries" is straying in the ratings.

What really hurt, he says, is the cancellation of the updated version of Groucho Marx's "You Bet Your Life," which Bill especially liked since it celebrated "good deeds by good people." Cosby now claims that "Life" didn't appeal to white people.

Add to this the cancellation of "Here and Now," the 1992 TV series which started Cosby's TV son, Malcolm-Jamal Warner, and which Cosby produced. The show barely lasted half a season and wasn't well written, Cosby now says. Even TV's biggest stars can have their production and ratings problems.

Q: What's going on with the Cosby family? Are the rumors about legal battles true? —G.F.

A: Three of Bing Crosby's children are suing the company run by their mother, Kathryn, Bing's widow. Mary, Harry and Nathaniel are alleging that Hillsborough Productions, Inc. may have breached its duties relating to their trust funds and property rights. They filed the case in the Santa Clara County (Calif.) Superior Court.

Q: What's this we hear about legendary Hollywood actress Lana Turner being seriously ill and virtually on her deathbed? —N.D.

A: No question that Lana has had serious physical problems over the last year or so. She

has been diagnosed with throat cancer and was recently hospitalized in Hollywood. The 64-year-old Hollywood big-screen legend is now coping with the aftereffects of the treatment for her condition. But Lana is maintaining her moxie — and her sense of humor. "Tell them that reports of my death are premature," she recently told one Hollywood scribe.

Latest word from her daughter, Cheryl, is that Turner will be released from the hospital shortly. Says Cheryl, "My mother is like the Energizer bunny. She keeps going and going. I wish I had her strength."

Q: Some time back there was talk of a sequel to "Rain Man," but nothing more. Cruise and Hoffman were so good together. Any idea why the project was abandoned? —T.M.

A: As we speak, the co-writer of the original script, Barry Morrow, is putting the finishing touches on "Rain Man 2." If Tom Cruise and Dustin Hoffman like the story line, they will probably do the sequel.

Q: We hear that Olivia Newton-John has had

some rough times lately. Can you tell us what the problems are? —H.R.

A: Olivia, 46, is indeed facing some real challenges in her personal life. Two years ago she

learned that she has breast cancer. The news, naturally enough, knocked her for a loop. She regrouped in strong fashion, however, and has survived bouts of surgery, chemotherapy, acupuncture and homeopathic treatments. She now says she's much better.

To compound matters, Newton-John has found her career in a downturn, her clothing boutique venture a failure and, most recently, her 10-year marriage to Matt Lattanzi, 36, on the rocks.

Olivia keeps busy: She appeared in a TV special, "A Christmas Romance," with her 9-year-old daughter, Chloe Lattanzi. And her new ecology-

themed record album, "Gaia," for which she wrote all the songs, made the charts in Australia; look for it in the States next year.

Q: How come Oscar-winning actress Jodie Foster refuses to discuss her love life? Does she have something to hide? —W.D.

A: Interviewees find that while Foster often appears to be forthcoming about many aspects

of her life, she's tough to pin down when things get personal. The 32-year-old Jodie is an outspoken feminist, but the 1985 Yale graduate is very tight-lipped about his private life.

Not too long ago, when a reporter for a now defunct gay publication asked her a leading question about her sexuality, Jodie just changed the subject.

Q: Is it true that Shannen Doherty has yet another

new boyfriend? What gives romantically with this mercurial former star of "Beverly Hills 90210"? —V.S.

A: The 23-year-old actress is currently living with her boyfriend, director Rob Weiss. It appears that she seems pretty content with her love life and herself. She has slimmed down a bit and now refers to herself as a "nice, Southern Baptist, Republican girl."

Q: We thought that Frank Sinatra Jr. did a good job on his father's latest duet album but doubt that it did much for Junior's career. Right? —H.R.

A: To the contrary, Sinatra Jr. is doing standing-room business at local clubs in Los Angeles these days. They turned people away from his four-show gig at L.A.'s super trendy Tatou. Fans lined up outside in the hopes of getting into Frank Jr.'s shows at the Moonlight Tango Cafe, a San Fernando Valley cafe popular with Hollywood celebrities.

Q: I read that supermodel Cindy Crawford is a darling of photographers who ask her to pose in public situations but that she never turns down a request. Is all this true? —A.A.

A: Not anymore. A member of the paparazzi corps told me, "Cindy used to be a sweetheart, but she's hardened... maybe because of all the Richard Gere flak. She use to acquiesce to a request for 'just one more head-to-toe shot,' but nowadays Crawford's more likely to say crisply, 'Not now' or 'Come back later.'"

"And whereas she used to gladly sign personalized inscriptions on 8-by-10 glossy's thrust at her, now she's inclined to turn down such requests — even from photographers she knows."

Q: We really like Chuck Norris, the star of TV's "Walker, Texas Ranger," one of the most powerful shows on TV. Is he married? —G.V.

A: For a long time, Norris, 54, was best known as a private martial arts trainer to the stars. He then broke into low-

budget flicks and rapidly became something of a marquee name. When his film career took a dip, the Oklahoma-born actor returned to TV.

He has three grown children — ages 31, 30 and 29 — from his long-time first marriage. After a mostly friendly divorce (Norris now says his ex deserves the large settlement she received), the actor remains single but attached. Monica, his current live-in girlfriend, is a former aerobics instructor in her early 20s.

Norris, who has purchased a 700-acre ranch in Texas, seems fairly happy domestically but is bothered by citations of "Walker, Texas Ranger" as "the third most violent show on TV. It's not that bad, says Chuck.

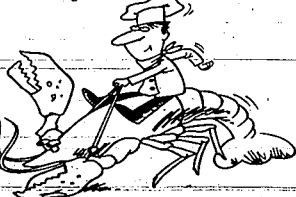
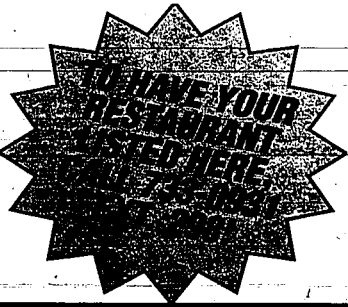

That was four years ago. The cast really cares and they give 100 percent of their talent all the time. But when your show is the lowest-rated soap, it puts you in a special place, in a manner of speaking. We all want to do better, of course, and with the new people behind the scenes, we have nowhere to go but up."

With Laura Sisk as the show's main cheerleader, "Loving" may just start that uphill climb out of the ratings cellar and surprise the skeptics who have been prophesizing the soap's demise for years now.

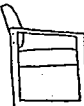

(There must be a few exceptions, like American Movie Classics, but we're having trouble remembering what they are.) Sure — promises interesting stuff. A few Sundance titles: "The Adventures of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert,"

"Vanya on 42nd Street," "Orlando," "Romeo Is Bleeding," "The Krays," "Germinal," "Menace II Society," "Belle Epoque." Also promised are foreign films and even documentaries. Projected cost to viewers: \$5 to \$7. Length: 24 hours a day.

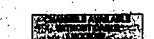

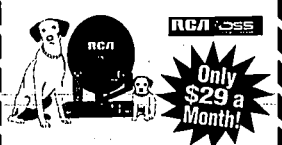
