Salmon murder charges dropped

SALMON — A Twin Falls mining engineer will not face the death penalty after murder charges were dropped in the shooting death of his fishing partner last March. Mike Peckenpaugh, 53, had stood accused of killing Twin Falls resident Allen Swafford, 42, following a drunken argument at their Salmon River campsite during the early morning hours of March 23, 1994.

The first-degree murder trial was supposed to begin Feb. 14.

But Peckenpaugh's lawyer, M. Lynn

Dunlap of Twin Falls, hastily arranged a press conference Thursday afternoon to announce that the case had been dismissed. Dunlap told *The Times-News* at least two witnesses could testify that Peckenpaugh was acting in self-defense when he fired the single deadly gunshot into Swafford's abdomen.

"There was no plea bargaining in this case," Dunlap said. "And this was an extraordinary result."

Lemhi County Prosecutor Milt Slavin was out of town Thursday notifying Swafford's next of kin of the dismissal and could not be reached for comment.

Dunlap said Peckenpaugh was defend-

ing himself and Swafford's fiancée, Vickie Pullman of Twin Falls, when he shot Swafford. "He warned Mr. Swafford prior to shooting. This is a very clear self-defense case," Dunlap said.

Dunlap also said he had been told earlier this week that prosecutors might drop the charges before next week's trial. That followed an interview prosecutors had Feb. 2 with two Montana witnesses who were staying in an adjacent camping trailer the night of the shooting. Dunlap said he had interviewed the Montana campers last spring and said both could testify on Peckenpaugh's behalf.

"Why nothing further took place until

Feb. 2, 1995, I don't know," Dunlap said.

He described Swafford as a nice and generous man who turned abusive, belligerent and violent while under the influence of drugs and alcohol. Swafford was a few inches taller and more than 100 pounds heavier than the 5-foot-10-inch, 185-pound Peckenpaugh.

Tests of Swafford's urine revealed traces of marijuana at the time of his death. Dunlap said a Boise toxicologist would testify that the amount of drugs in Swafford's system was equivalent to a blood-alcohol content level of .40, or about four times the state's legal driving limit. Blood tests also

Health education goes high-tech on link between hospitals, schools

TWIN FALLS — Open-heart surgery may soon become a public spectacle.

Operating on a federal grant, Twin Falls High School is almost ready to connect with Magic Valley Regional Medical Center and Twin Falls Clinic and Hospital via video and computer link.

Health sciences students will be able to watch doctors perform surgery and get a stitch-by-stitch account of what is happening, said high school Principal Carl Snow.

"If they're operating on a cadaver down at the clinic, our kids could come right in and watch it here," he said.

The link will extend to the College of Southern Idaho and from there to five area high schools: Jerome, Valley, Gooding, Mini-Cassia, Burley and Minico. It may eventually reach Buhl, Filer and Castleford, said Jerry Beck, CSI's vice

president of instruction.

It's part of a larger effort to expand health education in rural areas, which often face a severe shortage of community health educators. Classes like these will not only draw more rural students into the health professions, they'll help teach practical lessons like baby-sitting tips, Beck said.

Classes that can be beamed from the hospitals or the schools include food preparation and diabetes management, car seat programs and breast self-exam classes.

Dr. David A. McClusky, a local surgeon who supports the computer links, said he has already broadcast four surgery sessions to CSI nursing students.

"I usually get (the patients') permission to do that," he said. "Occasionally I have patients who volunteer."

He said the technology is important, not only for students, but for patients and health care workers in outlying areas.

"Say you're in the emergency room and don't know what to do with a case, you can hook into this system" and ask for help, he said. Another doctor miles away could coach them through surgery.

Spree leads to charges against 4

TWIN FALLS — After what police call a four-day spree of stealing cars and guns and burglarizing homes, four teenage boys were charged with grand theft Thursday.

The boys, on probation for other crimes, stole a dozen cars and burglarized 11 homes before police from seven agencies arrested them Wednesday night, said Lt. Bob Gauthier of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department.

"We haven't shaken everything from the tree yet," Gauthier said.

The boys confessed to stealing up to \$150,000 worth of property in Jerome, Twin Falls, Minidoka and Elko counties — but in their whirlwind escape, they couldn't remember all they had taken, said Detective Dan Chatterton of the Jerome County Sheriff's Department.

They stole up to \$4,000 worth of firearms, broke into Rupert and Jerome police cars, taking weapons and other police items, Chatterton said.

Reeling from marijuana, booze and lack of sleep, the teens apparently stole cars faster than they could be reported stolen Wednesday night, Chatterton said. They climbed onto a haystack and watched police examine a stolen black Chevrolet S-10 pickup, he said.

"They had gone four-wheeling in the desert in a Lincoln Continental and an Oldsmobile," Chatterton said. "We found the Lincoln stuck in the mud in Devils Corral, its wheels still spinning."

The boys started burglarizing cars Sunday, then hitting homes Monday, sometimes blasting apart windows and doors with stolen rifles to enter, Chatterton said. Most of the homes they burglarized in broad daylight, he said.

They began stealing cars that they had found unlocked with the keys inside, Chatterton said. Their spree included a trip to Jackpot, where they swapped one stolen car for another, and returned, he said.

Some people who noticed them prowling in their neighborhoods, chased the boys away instead of calling police, Chatterton said. But others called police, tipping them off and launching the multi-agency manhunt.

One man in Twin Falls County noticed them and drove over to confront them, Gauthier said. The 16-year-old Jerome boy leveled a stolen 12-gauge shotgun at him,

GOP trumpets welfare overhaul

WASHINGTON — Asserting that welfare has chained generations of women and children in poverty, Republicans sketched a plan Thursday that would deny cash aid to teen-age mothers and end the guarantee to benefits for all eligible Americans.

The welfare overhaul, outlined by Rep. Clay Shaw in a speech to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, tracks the hard-line reforms in the GOP's "Contract With America" but also consolidates nearly 50 social programs and returns the money to the states in three block grants.

Shaw, a Florida Republican who is chairman of the House Ways and Means subcommittee responsible for welfare reform, promised business leaders that his panel will approve legislation by the end of next week that

stops welfare from being a "lifelong program."

Under his plan, single parents would be required to work after two years on welfare, and cash benefits would end after five.

Single, unwed mothers under age 18 would be barred from receiving cash welfare, and most legal immigrants would be denied nearly every kind of public assistance.

The legislation also ends the entitlement status of Aid to Families with Dependent Children, which for decades has guaranteed benefits to children and their parents whose incomes and family circumstances meet state eligibility requirements.

Nearly 5 million families, and more than 9 million children, receive AFDC. Because it is an entitlement, the government spends whatever is necessary to cover

Swimmer reaches dry sand

OJSTINS, Barbados — They laughed at Guy Delage when he set off to swim the Atlantic, his life riding on a high-tech kickboard and a supply raft bearing a fax machine and foie gras for New Year's Eve.

When he struggled onto the white sand beach Thursday, his odyssey done, some were still laughing. They wondered if he'd really done much swimming at all. But they had to admit 55 days of dodging sharks, reefs and 10-foot waves was an adventure.

Delage, 42, was all elan when he set out Dec. 16 from the Cape Verde Islands, off the west coast of Africa. He said he was eager to experience "absolute solitude" and "a real risk of dying."

It was a considerably chastened Delage who came ashore Thursday. Delage said his adventure brought him depression, fatigue, loneliness and danger. The sea paid him a final indignity Wednesday by slamming him on a reef.

As Delage kicked toward shore in his south coast town, his wife, Katherine, sobbed in joy. Nine-year-old son Thomas broke away from the family and sprinted back and forth on the water-line, waving the French tricolor.

Katherine breast-stroked out to meet him, and Guy took off his face mask to kiss her. Then he hugged his eldest son and 5-year-old Clement, whom he carried out to the beach.



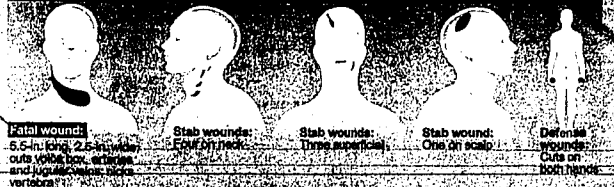
Transatlantic swimmer Guy Delage rums out of the ocean at Barbados Thursday after completing a 2,400-mile crossing.

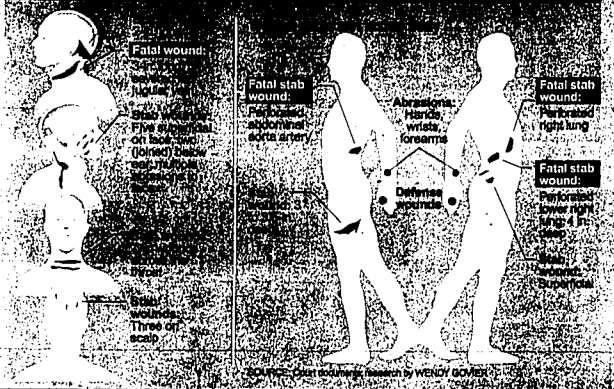

Developments Thursday in the O.J. Simpson case:

GRAPHIC PHOTOS: Some people cried, some looked away and some left the courtroom as gruesome color photos of the victims' bodies were shown to the jury on a 7-foot screen. The judge prevented the photos from being transmitted via TV.

POLICE TRAINING: Officer Robert Riské was the first officer to arrive at the crime scene early on June 13. Asked about his Police Academy training in how to preserve a crime scene, he said: "They kind of gloss over it. They don't really train you." He said he learned his skills on the job.

CANDLELIGHT BATH: When searching Nicole Brown Simpson's condo, Riské said, he found the master bathroom lighted with candles and the tub full of water.

BEST DRESSED: Judge Lance Ito told jurors they were the best dressed he'd ever seen. But he suggested they switch to casual clothes for their visit to the crime scene.

BACK ON THE JOB: Prosecutor William Hodgman returned to work Thursday two weeks after falling ill but said he won't be back in the courtroom. He said he would have taken a behind-the-scenes role even if he hadn't gotten sick.

WITNESS PLEA: Mary Anne Gerchias, who claims she saw four men leaving the area around Ms. Simpson's home the night of the murders, pleaded innocent to failing

to pay a hotel bill of more than \$23,000. She was released on bail.

THEY WANT 'MELROSE': Jurors who are fans of "Melrose Place" want to get caught up on past episodes and start watching the TV show while they're sequestered. Fox Broadcasting said Ito's office asked

for episodes of the show.

WHAT'S NEXT: Attorneys meet privately today with the judge to discuss scheduling. Court is not in session Monday because of a court holiday. When court resumes Tuesday, Officer Robert Riské will return to the stand.

Murder-scene condo receives nibbles, no takers

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The condo where Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman were slashed to death has drawn few lookers and no takers since the slayings. The four-bedroom home is listed for sale at

\$795,000 or for lease at \$5,100 a month. The newspaper ad declares it a "Beautiful Mediterranean villa." Inquiring real estate agents find out quickly about its history. "I tell them on the phone the minute they call,

'Are you aware that it's Nicole Simpson's condo?'" said real estate agent Pauline Walsh Rimp. "Sometimes you hear dead silence. Sometimes they say yes. Sometimes they say, 'I'll tell my client and get back to you.'"

Quayle bows out of '96 campaign

WASHINGTON (AP) — Hard-pressed to attract the money and talent necessary for a strong campaign, former Vice President Dan Quayle abruptly reversed course Thursday and said he would not seek the 1996 Republican presidential nomination. Quayle's decision came less than three weeks after he vowed to campaign aggressively as a voice for the conservative "silent majority" that he said was appalled at the decline of the family and the liberal bent of the social welfare system.

"He is completely recovered," said Quayle adviser Mark Goodin.

"He was extremely excited and fired up about running a campaign," said Goodin. "But the financial aspect of it threw a bucket of cold water on his enthusiasm."

The decision leaves three definite Republican candidates: Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole of Kansas, Sen. Phil Gramm of Texas and former Gov. Lamar Alexander of Tennessee. A handful of others are contemplating runs, including Sens. Richard Lugar of Indiana and Arlen Specter of Pennsylvania, as well as 1992 Bush primary challenger Patrick Buchanan. A few GOP governors and California Rep. Bob Dornan also are mulling the race.

Because 75 percent of the delegates will be divided up in a six-

week stretch beginning a year from now in Iowa, Republican strategists suggest candidates need to raise \$20 million or more this year. Quayle had scoffed at that, saying he could get by with a smaller budget provided he surprised his rivals by winning an early primary.

But after signing on Goodin, pollster David Hill and a few other campaign hands, Quayle found it tough to recruit veteran operatives and even tougher to raise money. "It was money and bodies," said Reed.

Quayle made the decision late Wednesday night — just hours after telling reporters in Miami he planned to file candidacy papers later this month and formally announce his candidacy in April.

Since leaving office with the Bush administration, Quayle has kept a relatively low profile while living in Indiana and pursuing business interests.

Many longtime advisers had urged Quayle not to run, suggesting he stay active in business or perhaps run for governor of Indiana as part of an effort to rebuild his image. But Quayle ignored their advice, even after his health problems, and on Jan. 21 delivered an impassioned speech to an Indianapolis convention outlining the themes of his planned campaign.

Cancer survivor leads team to mountain peak

MT. ACONEGUA, Argentina — A Ketchum woman was among five American breast cancer survivors who scaled a 23,000-foot Argentinean mountain peak over the weekend.

Laura Evans of Ketchum led the summit team. She was once given a 15 percent chance of living five years.

Twelve other breast cancer survivors trekked to a 13,800-foot-high base camp on Mt. Aconagua with the Expedition Inspiration team.

The climbers hope to raise \$2.3 million, or \$100 for each foot of Aconagua for breast cancer research and programs.

The nonprofit San Francisco-based Breast Cancer Fund estimates that the group is about halfway to the \$2.3 million goal.

Highway 75 slide-off lands Richfield residents in hospital

SHOSHONE — Two women and two children from Richfield were injured Thursday when their car slid off state Highway 75.

Beverly Maddatt, 19, and Christy Ponciano, 11, were in serious condition Thursday evening; Michelle Johnston, 11, was in fair condition and Sharon Johnston, 41, was released from Magic Valley Regional Medical Center, a nursing supervisor said.

The group was heading north on a school skiing trip at 9 a.m. when Sharon Johnston, the driver, tried to pass another car on a foggy, icy stretch of highway and lost control, said Cpl. Gayland Edwards of the Idaho State Police.

Johnston's green 1993 Ford Explorer swerved off the west side of the road and tumbled into the lava rocks, Edwards said. The car slid out of control just north of the Mammoth Ice Caves, he said.

All four were wearing seat belts, he said.

Buhl homeowners, firefighters tackle morning roof blaze

BUHL — An attic fire burned the roof of a single story home Thursday morning.

Homeowner Mike Elam put out most of the flames, but not before the fire burned the roof and some of the kitchen ceiling rafters of the home south of Buhl, said Captain Earl Tyree of the Buhl Fire Department.

Smoke had engulfed the house by the time fire fighters arrived at 6:50 a.m., Tyree said. Electrical wiring in the attic might have ignited the fire, he said.

"We don't know what it is for sure," Tyree said.

No one was hurt.

Agency seeks comment on hunting regulation changes

TWIN FALLS — Anyone with an opinion on proposed changes for next season's Idaho hunting regulations is encouraged to speak their mind at a series of public hearings next week.

Most of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game's proposed changes seek to add more deer and elk permits in selected hunting units. An entirely new deer hunt — with 400 permits — is proposed for Unit 43, while a new antlerless elk hunt — with 100 permits — is proposed for Unit 49-4.

A new muzzleloader hunt for 50 antlerless elk is proposed for Unit 43, below Faithville.

However, the proposals also seek to reduce the number of antlerless deer permits by 200 in hunting Unit 45-3. The number of antlerless elk permits in Unit 44-2 is slated to fall by 50, while the number of antlerless elk permits in Unit 44-3 would be reduced by 100. The proposed decreases are due to declining numbers of animals.

No changes are proposed for antelope, bear, mountain lion, and general deer hunts in the department's Magic Valley region.

Public hearings will be Feb. 13 at the Blaine County Courthouse in Hailley; Feb. 14 at the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare building in Twin Falls; and Feb. 15 at Glenns Ferry High School. All hearings will begin at 7 p.m.

Prosecutor calls for grand jury

TWIN FALLS — The last one was a first... but a new grand jury in Twin Falls County has been summoned and 40 jurors will convene later this month.

Twin Falls County Prosecutor G. Richard Bevan requested the grand jury and 5th Judicial District Administrative Judge J. William Hart signed the order.

"The lion's share of these cases will be child abuse cases," Bevan said Thursday. The grand jury might also be used in "vulnerable victim" cases — such as rape — and extremely complex cases such as embezzlement, he said.

"I don't consider a drug case or a burglary to be anywhere near that," he said. "I will be selective with my use of it."

Bevan said he already has four or five cases ready to send to the grand jury. But some attorneys are skeptical of

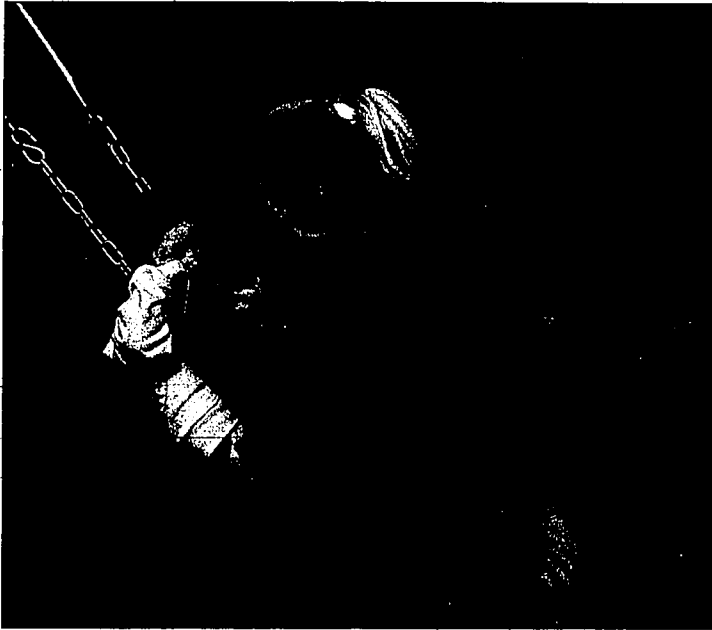
grand juries, which enable prosecutors to go behind closed doors to present evidence and witnesses — without interference from judges or defense attorneys. If a jury is swayed, it hands up criminal indictments and accused parties are put on trial in open court.

"The chief evil of a grand jury is the secrecy element," said Twin Falls County Public Defender Mike Wood.

"The small-town grand jury is one of the most dangerous elements in our criminal justice system," Wood said. "Any prosecutor could indict a ham sandwich with a grand jury."

Lawmaker opts for compromise, pulls plug on water management measure

BOISE — Saying compromise may avoid the need for legislation or expensive litigation, state Rep. Doug Jones, R-Filer, withdrew a proposal Thursday to dump controversial Idaho Department of Water Resources rules.

Jones had wanted the House Natural Resources Committee to oppose the Water Resources rules on conjunctive management of surface and ground water. But water attorneys told Jones that negotiations are underway and a solution may be in sight.

Jones said water groups think they can reach a consensus. "I don't know what the new language is, but I'm certainly willing to let them negotiate some more," he said.

The rules were created by Water Resources Director Keith Higginson under a 1993 court order. They make it harder for Idahoans with older water rights to get their water — cheaply — when there's a shortage.

The Twin Falls and North Side canal companies filed suit in January, seeking to block the rules.

Opponents of the rules argue that they



undermine Idaho water law and the doctrine of prior appropriation. By forcing senior water rights holders to seek "reasonable means" before demanding water from junior holders, the rules are burdening the senior appropriators and undermining property rights, opponents insist.

Supporters note that a water management plan that doesn't include both ground and surface water users is likely to fail. And with water scarce — and the number of people with permits great — they say a conjunctive management plan is essential.

Water lawyer John Rosholt, who represents Magic Valley canal companies, confirmed that new compromise rules are being drafted, but didn't divulge any areas of agreement.

"We're going about putting those together and hope to propose those in the next couple of days," he said.

Noting the canal companies' pending lawsuits against Water Resources, Rosholt said the proposals will be offered in good faith.

"If the Legislature would adopt these amendments, we'd be willing to drop the lawsuit, but it's not a gun to their head," he said.

Jones' proposal appeared to have backing from the Idaho Farm Bureau Federation county office in Twin Falls. Farm Bureau officials there said they oppose the rules "in their present form."

But Jones faced a challenge from House Majority Leader Bruce Newcomb, R-Buhl, who says the matter should be settled outside of the Legislature.

Noting that 5th District Judge Daniel Hurlbut ordered the rules, Newcomb said Jones' bill would only force Water Resources to draft a new set of controversial rules, which would also be challenged in court.

Senate sends tax-relief bill to governor

BOISE — Idaho's \$40 million property relief package is only one signature away from becoming law.

Thursday, the Idaho Senate overwhelmingly endorsed House Bill 156, which provides across the board property tax relief.

Despite grumbling from Democrats — and several notable Republicans — the Senate backed Gov. Phil Batt's relief plan, which shifts a portion of school maintenance and operations funding from local property taxes to the state general fund. The proposal also puts a 3 percent annual cap on the growth of taxes — a move many conservatives feared.

Finally delivered. "It's a day I've longed for a long time, it's a day the taxpayers have longed for a long time," he added.

While Risch praised the bill's passage, state Sen. Tim Tucker, D-Forthill, called it "another blight on the political and legislative process."

Homeowners, Tucker said, won't have much to celebrate come tax time. "They're going to look at the tax bill and they're going to wonder where the tax relief went."

Opponents said 70 percent of the tax relief contained in the bill would go to businesses, landlords, and out-of-state landlords. Some of them argued for a sales tax rebate, saying 70 percent of sales taxes are paid by people — not businesses, corporations, or Californians.

One speaker suggested Idahoans were crying out for tax relief and didn't care

whether it came in the form of property tax, sales tax, or income tax cuts. That brought a quick retort from Senate President Pro Tempore Jerry Twigg, R-Blackfoot.

Senators who didn't hear voter demands for property tax relief weren't listening, Twigg said. Noting Batt won't have promising the cuts, Twigg said, "Obviously people out there were buying what he was selling."

Of five Magic Valley senators, only Sen. Clint Stennett, D-Ketchum, opposed the package. He asked why out-of-staters, with million dollar vacation homes in Sun Valley, deserve big tax breaks.

"The biggest recipients in this thing are the Magic Valley Mall, J.R. Simplot, Union Pacific Railroad, and Idaho Power who

Patients put surgery bill on 'plastic'

TWIN FALLS — Credit cards can buy clothing, gasoline, televisions and food — and in the Magic Valley, "plastic money" can now help pay for health care.

Magic Valley Regional Medical Center this week mailed 15,000 applications for MedCash, a health-care credit card, to households with open medical center accounts.

"It gives patients the opportunity to apply for a credit card strictly for their health-care bill," said Day Eguagiza, director of business services at the medical center. "Patients really understand the credit-card concept."

The medical center began offering the credit-card payment option to patients last month, and 100 to 125 people tried the idea, Eguagiza said.

"This month we'll see that number go up a great deal," said Eguagiza, adding that some local doctors' offices have shown interest in the card.

MedCash also could be offered through the proposed physician-hospital organization, as well as the managed-care package jointly being worked on by medical center, Twin Falls Clinic & Hospital and St. Benedict's Family Medical Center in Jerome, she said.

As more insurance companies go from a co-payment of 80-20 to 70-30 — leaving patients with 10 percent more of their bills to pay — MedCash should be a benefit to many people, Eguagiza said. Most patient balances are about \$1,000 a visit, she said.

To get a MedCash card, households need a combined gross income of \$1,000 a month and be listed with a credit bureau for 1½ years, said Robert Richardson, vice president of sales and marketing for MedCash Health System Limited Partnership in Shawnee Mission, Kan.

More than 15,000 health-care providers nationwide accept MedCash, Richardson said. MedCash, which has operated more than eight years, started its emphasis on the hospital market a little more than a year ago, Richardson said.

The average MedCash credit line nationwide is slightly more than \$2,400, but the average Magic Valley resident's credit line could run higher, he said.

Eguagiza said she anticipates most Magic Valley Regional Medical Center patients qualify for a MedCash card will have a credit line of \$1,000 to \$2,000.

Richardson said MedCash is the largest and one of a few national health-care credit cards. There also are about 50 regional health-care credit cards nationwide offered through banks, he added.

"It's kind of a new idea, and it's catching on," Richardson said.

Micron cancels visit to sites in Kootenai, Spokane counties

POST FALLS (AP) — On the heels of a victory at the polls, city and business leaders in Post Falls say voters boosted chances that Kootenai County will land Micron Technology Inc.'s \$1.3 billion semiconductor plant.

But Wednesday's celebration was short-lived when Micron canceled next week's three-day tour of Kootenai County and neighboring Spokane County in Washington by a search team. The company cited scheduling difficulties.

Voters Tuesday rejected an initiative — by a margin of 1,096 to 666 — that would have required an election each time the city

uses tax-increment financing.

Such financing is likely to play a major role in trying to lure Micron to Kootenai County, which is among 13 finalists nationwide for the Boise-based company's planned expansion. The new plant would create about 3,500 jobs.

Even though Micron has canceled next week's visit, business recruiters and the company insist the region has not been snubbed in its quest to attract the computer chip factory.

Micron expects to choose a site by the end of the month.

"We're not being ignored," said Bob Potter, president of Kootenai County's Jobs Plus Inc.

"We certainly cleared a major hurdle on Tuesday," said city administrator John Hendrickson. "There was hope in some (competing) cities that we would get spanked by this thing and be seen as rejecting Micron."

The election was spawned by a citizens initiative authorized by the Kootenai County Property Owners Association. The association's president, Ron Rankin, said the measure failed in part because of a well-orchestrated advertising and public relations campaign by the city and its top business leaders.

Although Tuesday's initiative did not mention Micron, voters generally viewed the measure as a referendum on the company locating in Post Falls, Hendrickson said.

"It would have been difficult for me to explain to Micron if we had lost this measure," Potter said.

But with the planned tour by Micron's seven-member search team on hold, plans to invite Washington Gov. Mike Lowry and Congressman George Nethercutt of Spokane also are on hold. Dinners, official receptions

and business meetings in Post Falls and Spokane have been postponed.

Spokane and Coeur d'Alene business recruiters viewed next week's meetings as prime opportunities to showcase their region, said Development Council, said scheduling problems are common, but frustration is not.

"We don't know the real reason, to be honest," Cooper said. "But we're somewhat far, so I doubt it's a snub."

Micron spokeswoman Julie Smith said a public meeting scheduled for Feb. 16 in Post Falls will take place as planned.

Council reopens fish-plan debate

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) — A unanimous Northwest Power Planning Council voted Thursday to reopen debate on the science behind its plan to save imperiled Columbia Basin salmon runs from extinction.

"If the council's plan is to have usefulness, it has to be subscribed to more widely" by members, Montana delegate John Eichart said in introducing the motion.

Because of the political turnover in the November elections, only half of the eight members of the current council voted on the council's amended salmon strategy in December, splitting 2-2, Eichart noted.

With four new members — two from Idaho and one each from Washington and Oregon — the council plans to review documentation that was used to set requirements for river flows, dam spills, fish transportation and reservoir drawdowns.

The council plans to adopt a time line for the review at its March 15 meeting.

"I want to look at the science so that new and old members can feel comfortable" with the council's plan, said Washington member Ben Cassant.

Montana member Stan Grace, who with Eichart voted against the amended plan in December, called the motion "a definite step forward."

Oregon member Joyce Cohen noted the council is in agreement on 80 percent of the plan, but the effort at clarifying its underlying scientific principles "will be an opportunity to help the region understand" it.

The motion indicates a new political reality on the interstate council.

Craig proposes logging bill that would ease fire threats

WASHINGTON (AP) — Some logging in national forests would be exempted from environmental regulations to help reduce energy fire risks and recover dead wood before it rots, under a bill Sen. Larry Craig and other Western Republicans proposed Thursday.

Craig, R-Idaho, introduced the bill in the Senate to try to expedite the logging, partly by relaxing a law protecting fish, wildlife and water quality in cases where the fire threats are the greatest.

"We don't need to watch our natural resources go up in smoke when there is a critical need for wood fiber to sustain our industry and communities," Craig said.

Environmentalists oppose parts of the bill which would eliminate the right of citizens to challenge the harvests with administrative appeals in cases where the most serious fire dangers were identified.

They also object to a provision that says some of the smaller salvage logging operations, up to 1 million board feet, would be exempt from normal reviews under the National Environmental Policy Act.

"They want to commence extensive logging operations under the guise of forest health," said Dr. John Osborn, head of the Inland Empire Public Lands Council in Spokane, Wash.

"There are hundreds of thousands of acres of trees which are dead or dying in eastern Oregon, and southern and central Oregon are not far behind," Packwood said.

"We cannot, and should not, stop managing our forests because of the obstructionist tactics of a few groups and individuals," Gorton said.

Sen. Howell Heflin, D-Ala., signed on as an original cosponsor of the bill.

Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle, D-S.D., said he wants to study further some of the bill's more controversial measures. But he said Craig's bill "provides a valuable framework for addressing these critical issues."

Craig said in a Senate floor speech that the threat of fire makes it necessary for Congress to move rapidly.

"Our window of opportunity is very narrow," he said. "It would be foolish ... to sit by and say, 'Oh, but it is Mother Nature at her finest.'"

Rancher, experts argue wolf issue

SANDPOINT (AP) — A Priest River rancher says his 500-acre ranch with her husband, Orestes, is being attacked by livestock.

"We have no evidence to suggest wolves are involved in any way," said Ted Koehn, a wildlife biologist for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. "I will say emphatically that a wolf did not kill the cows or burros."

Koehn said the cow he found last month was no blood or bite-marks on it. The burros appeared to have been scavenged and coyotes — maybe even a wolf — did not die from a wolf attack, he said.

Improvements cut Cascade use

BOISE (AP) — New energy efficiency improvements at Boise Cascade's Emmett lumber mill — made possible through an Idaho Power energy conservation program — will save enough electricity each year to meet the needs of approximately 230 of the utility's typical residential customers.

The use of high-efficiency motors to precisely control the amount of heat used in the mill's lumber drying kilns will reduce its annual electricity use by 3.2 million kilowatt hours and help produce a better grade of lumber. This improvement was partially funded through Idaho Power's Partners in Industrial Efficiency program.

Under the program, the utility agrees to pay 10 cents per kilowatt hour saved on an annual basis up to \$250,000 for each qualifying project or half of the project's cost, whichever is less. Boise Cascade will receive a check for \$250,000.

Russian Goliath reels in Chechnya

LONDON — David didn't defeat Goliath in Chechnya — but he delivered powerful and unexpected blows to the body, and especially to the ego.

What went wrong? Why did poorly equipped, inexperienced Chechen fighters hold off heavily armed Russian troops carrying the mantle of the old Soviet superpower for more than a month?

As Chechen separatists take their war for independence from Russia into the countryside, military analysts have been examining Moscow's poor performance in its first military encounter since the Cold War ended.

Some reasons for Russia's bungled invasion of Chechnya are clear. Units that had never trained together were sent to fight together — motorized rifle troops, airborne troops, naval infantry and Ministry of Interior soldiers.

Commanders used disastrous military tactics to try to take the Chechen capital of Grozny, sending in tanks that were destroyed by Chechen petrol bombs. On top of that, the high command in Moscow was wracked with dissension about the merits of the war. Three deputy defense ministers were suspended for criticizing the operation.

Jonathan Eyal of the Royal United Services Institute for Defense Studies said the decision to fight was taken by the Security Council in Moscow, which is responsible only to President Boris Yeltsin, and never had real military support.

Behind the rush to invade Chechnya in the inhospitable winter, with little preparation time, was a bungled covert operation by Russia's security services to topple Chechen President Dzhokhar Dudayev, Eyal said. After 20 captured Russian security agents were paraded on Chechen television, the security council decided in late December to invade.

"As far as the military is concerned, the entire urgency of the operation was to cover the backside of the security services, to cover this bungled operation. Their hearts were not in it. They sent units not up to full strength — kids with a few months of training," Eyal said.

"But what was more humiliating was

that the military fell into the same trap the United States and France and Britain fell into over the past 20 years — which is essentially that all their strategies were designed to fight a world war and they were expected to fight a Third World War," Eyal said in an interview.

Dr. Mark Galotti, a lecturer in international history at the University of Keele, wrote in Jane's Intelligence Review that the first month of the Chechen invasion cost more Russian lives than the first six months of the Afghan war. He gave no figures but Russian officials have reported 1,200 servicemen dead.

The war highlighted four key problems in the new Russian army: disunity of the high command, lack of coordination between units and services, low morale and combat readiness, and a failure to apply Russia's new military doctrine that dwells on the need for rapid deployment forces, Galotti wrote.

Col. Andrew Duncan, spokesman for the International Institute for Strategic Studies, said the Russian military faced "very real challenges" in mounting the Chechnya operation because it is in a period of transition.

It is still trying to accommodate units withdrawn from Eastern Europe. A totally new budgetary concept has reduced funds for the armed forces. Its planned rapid reaction force isn't ready. It lost a large manpower pool when the central Asian republics became independent and has to cope with thousands of student deferments, Duncan said.

"Perhaps the guilt lies in not having foreseen that this military operation might have happened," he said. "The military might then have had some plans and maps."

Eyal said the real impact of Chechnya is that Yeltsin is now more detested by the military than ever before.

"For the West, the real message is that whenever confronted by what is essentially a difficult constitutional problem, the first reaction of the Russian government is to resort to force. This is not the instinct of democracy that we expected," he said.

U.S. veterans promote search for MIAs of both sides

HANOI, Vietnam (AP) — U.S. vets have embarked on a new plan: To solve the MIA puzzle, they are helping Vietnamese find out what happened to their own MIAs.

The Vietnam Veterans of America has asked its members to turn over battlefield souvenirs that could help locate the remains of more than 300,000 Vietnamese. By contrast, there are 2,211 Americans missing in action from the war.

For months the group has been collecting photos, letters, identification cards and other items

taken two decades ago from dead and captive Vietnamese.

"We want the families on both sides to be able to rest, knowing the fates of their loved ones," Thomas Corey, national secretary for the VVA, told Vietnamese officials Thursday at the start of the group's 10-day visit.

The veterans plan to turn over their latest batch of artifacts to Vietnamese officials Monday.

Their hosts limited a two-way exchange might-take place but gave no details.

Kasparov to defend chess title in September

COLOGNE, Germany (AP) — Garry Kasparov will defend his world chess title in Germany in September and hopes to face Anatoly Karpov in 1996 in a match to produce the undisputed world champion.

Top-level chess diverged into two streams in 1993 when Kasparov walked out of the International Chess Federation to create the Professional Chess Association.

U.S. wants fugitive's visa back

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — U.S. officials once gave a visa to far-right paramilitary leader Emmanuel Constant. Now they want it back.

Constant — founder of the violent FRAPH militia that terrorized Haitians under the military regime — fled attempted murder charges here in December.

"It is entirely possible" he is in the United States, embassy spokesman Stan Schrage told The Associated Press Thursday.

Constant's U.S. visa had been revoked in 1993 but was reissued when all U.S. sanctions against Haiti were lifted last October.

On Wednesday, the embassy asked the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service to once again revoke it.

Schrage said authorities tried "to cancel his visa, but we couldn't get our hands on his passport."

Now "if he leaves the country and tries to get back in he won't be able to," Schrage said.

Constant, the son of a former army commander during the dictatorship of Francois "Papa Doc" Duvalier, formed the pro-army paramilitary Front for the Advancement and Progress in Haiti in 1993.

Russia sends 1 of 4 subs to China

LONDON (AP) — Russia has delivered the first of four new patrol submarines that will dramatically improve China's fleet and has raised fears of new Chinese aggression in Asia and the Pacific.

Robert Kamiol, Asia-Pacific editor of Jane's Defense Weekly, said the \$1 billion deal for the advanced Kilo-class diesel vessels was signed in November.

The first sub is on a Chinese mer-

chant ship heading for China, Kamiol said Thursday.

"This is a major generational jump from China's current fleet, and there are fears that it could use the vessels to push its own interests in the region," he said by telephone from his office in Bangkok, Thailand.

The diesel submarines can stay at sea for several weeks and have sophisticated search-and-attack sonars.

Writer/poet Baxter Black hears the Western muse

TWIN FALLS — Baxter Black's first attempt at writing poetry came in college while he was studying to become a veterinarian.

The assignment he turned in came back with a red "F" marked at the top. "Write about what you know," the professor scolded.

Black says he took that advice to heart and, since he began writing for a living in 1982, it has been the key to his success. By putting his own ranch life, livestock experiences and veterinary knowledge into print, he has become the best-selling cowboy poet and rural humorist in America.

Black, 49, has written a dozen books, recorded seven cassette tapes and made two full-length videos, all of which have sold in volume nationally.

"Part of the charm of cowboy poetry is that the people who write it are writing about things they know," he said.

In a telephone interview from Elko, Nev., Black said he travels around the country to make about 100 appearances a year at banquets, conventions, fairs, agricultural shows and concerts. His weekly column, "On the Edge of Common Sense," appears in 225 newspapers and magazines, making it the most widely syndicated agricultural column in the United States.

Like a journal, this column catches Black's everyday observations at life on his Colorado ranch and on the road, visiting with the many ranchers, cowboys, vegetable growers and veterinarians who come to his shows.

Proceeds will go to the CSI Ag Club to help pay for students to travel to state and national leadership competitions this year.

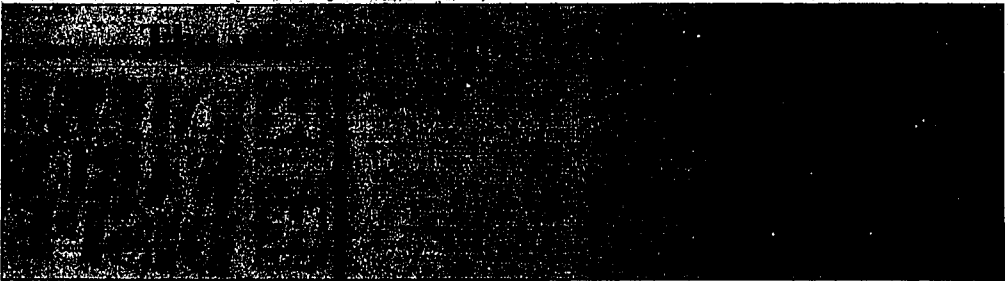
"Through the years, the column has been the most important thing I do," Black said. "Not for the money, but for any philosophy I want to examine. The

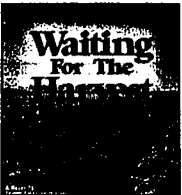

As the story evolves, characters embark on a school bus trip to Thousand Springs Trout Farm, eat chicken fried steak at George K's Restaurant and attend a performance at O'Leary Junior High.

Garth Brooks inhales sweet smell of success

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — It's a yet another 20-minute telethon. It's for the biggest star in country music, scheduled for a performance in Detroit and traveling to do another for Wal-Mart in Bentonville, Ark.

Garth Brooks makes the allotted time seem longer than it is! He is accommodating all his intense when he easily could afford to relax a little, let some of the demands for his attention slide.

Not a chance. Unlike many stars with half his sales, Garth Brooks gives every indication of being as hungry as he was in 1987 — a kid from Oklahoma who came to Nashville with an advertising degree and dreams of being the next George Strait.

"To me, the score is 0-0 now," said Brooks, of his decision to allow EMI Records to finally release a greatest hits compilation, "The Hits." The album was released on Christmas and jumped to the top of the country and pop album charts.

The very idea worried Brooks at first. He's sold some 42 million copies of his albums (plus a Christmas album) and he's not sure why they shouldn't be successful. "I hate the idea of the greatest hits being put there," Brooks avows. EMI won him over with a solution that made sense to his adman side.

EMI agreed to sell "The Hits" for only 4-6 months, meaning that fans better pick it up by this summer or they're out of luck. "Hopefully, people that have never bought a GB piece of product will buy this 'cause it has all the hits, and when they hear it hopefully it'll entice them to go out and get the album they're off of," Brooks said.

The album also comes with a "CD Zoom" — "This is 61 cuts of all our stuff, 20-second snippets of each."

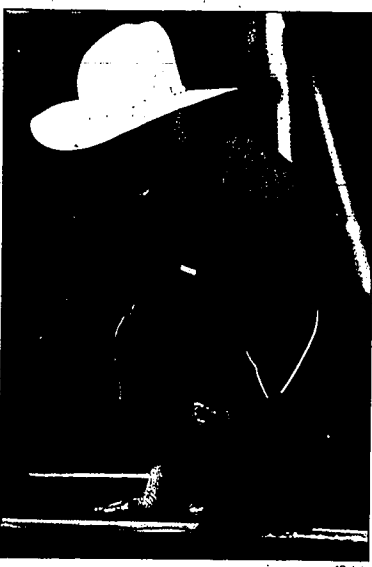

Priscilla, Queen of the Desert" takes the standard road movie formula and dolls it up with plenty of pitmanque and catty badinage. Written and directed by Stephan Elliott — and costarring Hugo Weaving and Guy Pearce as the two younger drug queens in the company of Stamp's daunting, dim-motherish Bernadette — the film is anything but deep. But what this campy lark lacks in substance and subtlety, it strives to make up for in outlandish costumes, and in situations that exploit its trio's flagrantly unnatural presence in the natural expanse of the Australian desert. When was the last time you saw cross-dressers in satin and sky-high ostrich headgear clomping across barren rockscapes, silhouetted by a full moon?

The Priscilla of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert" is the junkheap schoolbus used to transport this threesome, known in their song-and-dance act as "Les Girls," to a cabaret gig in Alice Springs. (Is it only a coincidence that they travel from the male-monikered Sydney to a town with a female appellation?)

Bernadette, Mitzi and Felicia's specialty is lip-synching to disco hits of the '70s — Gloria Gaynor, Peaches and Herb, the irrepressible Abba — with choreography that teeters on the edge of parody. (Tocostors, and gleefully topples.) In metropolitan burgs, this sort of thing goes over like gangbusters, but out in the outback, where the men are manly (and some of the women, too), the drag troupe's extravagan-

za on- and-offstage behavior is threatening. And when they steer Priscilla onto a dubious short cut further out in the outback, the showfolk may as well be aliens plopped down from Venus as far as the local toss-another-shrimp-on-the-barbies are concerned.

Although Elliott's movie — photographed in widescreen, the better to take in the epic horizons and exotic Down Under wildlife — generally plays it light and loose, this cultures-in-conflict cross-dressing comedy has its heavier moments. Homophobia is addressed in a series of ugly incidents, and there are individual crises (identity and otherwise) to be dealt with. Weaving, who played the blind protagonist in Jocelyn Moorhouse's exceptional "Proof,"

gives his Mitzi — a k a Tick — a suitably tense, vulnerable quality. And Pearce, an Australian soap opera star, exudes the arch acerbity required of his Felicia/Adam.

Stamp's performance is not only brave — it's transcendent. As a blonde named Ralph who long ago underwent the necessary surgical and hormonal alterations to become a big brunette beauty, the actor brings poise and dignity to what could have easily been another exercise in gender-bending schtick. The expression on Stamp's face as his Bernadette tolerates her two bickering, bitchy companions is at once wise and worldly-weary. At other times, Stamp's character — witty, debauched, and resolute — can't be described as demure.

Western people, he explained.

"Johnny Carson expected 'Hee Haw' and it isn't 'Hee Haw,'" Black said. "Cowboy poetry is clever. It's genuinely funny. And when a guy tells a story about what it's like being bucked off, there's a pretty good chance he knows what he's talking about. It isn't contrived. There's a genuineness that makes it good."

In addition to Rudyard Kipling, Black said his favorite writers are "oldtime cowboy poets Banjo Paterson, the author of 'Man From Snowy River' and 'Waltzing Matilda,' and Curley Fletcher, who wrote 'Strawberry Roan.'"

Then he (Fletcher) turned around and wrote "The Castration of the Strawberry Roan, which is wicked," Black said. "I love it

when somebody is willing to pull their own leg."

Black owns a humble country boy, unpretentious and unimpressed with the bright lights of stardom. He recalls with fondness his 10 years working as a veterinarian in Grand View, and his travels to small towns throughout the Maggie Valley.

"I'd rather do a night in Bliss than the Tonight Show," he said frankly. "I'm more at home with country people. They're just my kind of folks. The feeling I have with those kind of people is the reason I do what I do. It's not like Hollywood and it's not like Nashville."

Black has lived at his ranch in Colorado since 1980. He and his wife, Cindy Lou, have a daughter, 15, and an 18-month-old son.

"All I ever wanted to do was be in the cow business and I am, in a way," he said. "I enjoyed being a vet. I never planned on doing anything else."

In his first novel, "Hey Cowboy, Wanna Get Lucky?," Black spins a tale of two bullriders, Lick and Cody, traveling the rodeo road. In their daily trials, tangles and triumphs, by the month of June this pair is still "a congressman's salary away" from qualifying for the National Finals Rodeo in December.

In bookstores since August, "Hey Cowboy..." already is in its eighth printing.

In its forward, Black promises his book will provide "a modest smattering of sex, violence, intrigue and the occasional philosophical observation."

Written and directed by Stephen Elliott — and co-starring Hugo Weaving and Guy Pearce as the two young, glib queers in the company of Steve and the laundress-motherish Bernadette — the film is anything but deep. But what this campy lark lacks in substance and subtlety, it strives to make up for in outlandish costumes, and in situations that exploit its trio's flagrantly unnatural presence in the natural expanse of the Australian desert.

When was the last time you saw cross-dressers in satin and sky-high ostrich headgear clomping across barren rangelands, silhouetted by a full moon?

The Priscilla of "Priscilla, Queen of the Desert" is the junkheap schoolbus used to transport this threesome, known in their song-and-dance act as "Les Girls," to a cabaret gig in Alice Springs. (Is it only a coincidence that they travel from the male-monikered Sydney to a town with a female appellation?)

Bernadette, Mitzi and Felicia's specialty is lip-synching to disco hits of the '70s — Gloria Gaynor, Peaches and Herb, the irrepressible Abba — with choreography that teeters on the edge of parody. (Teeters, and gleefully topples.) In cosmopolitan burlesque, this sort of thing goes over like gangbusters, but out in the outback, where the men are manly (and some of the women, too), the drag troupe's extravagan-

za on- and- offstage behavior is threatening. And when they steer Priscilla onto a dubious short cut further out in the outback, the showfolk may as well be aliens plopped down from Venus as far as the local toss-another-shrimp-on-the-tobacco are concerned.

Although Elliott's movie — photographed in widescreen, the better to take in the epic horizons and exotic Down Under wildlife — generally plays it light and loose, this cultures-in-conflict cross-dressing comedy has its heavier moments. Homophobia is addressed in a series of ugly incidents, and there are individual crises (identity and otherwise) to be dealt with. Weaving, who played the blind protagonist in Jocelyn Moorhouse's exceptional "Proof,"

gives his Mitzi — a k a Tick — a suitably tense, vulnerable quality. And Pearce, an Australian soap opera star, exudes the arch acerbity required of his Felicia/Adam.

Stamp's performance is not only brave — it's transcendent. As a bloke named Ralph who long ago underwent the necessary surgical and hormonal alterations to become a big brunet beauty, the actor brings poise and dignity to what could have easily been another exercise in gender-bending shtick. The expression on Stamp's face as his Bernadette tolerates her two bickering, bitchy companions is at once wise and worldly-weary. At other times, Stamp's character — witty, debauched and resolute — can only be described as demure.

western people, he explained. "Johnny Carson expected 'Hee Haw' and it isn't 'Hee Haw,'" Black said. "Cowboy poetry is clever. It's genuinely funny. And when a guy tells a story about what it's like being bucked off, there's a pretty good chance he knows what he's talking about. It isn't contrived. There's a genuineness that makes it good."

In addition to Rudyard Kipling, Black said his favorite writers are old-time cowboy poets Banjo Paterson, the author of "Man From Snowy River" and "Waltzing Matilda," and Curley Fletcher, who wrote "Strawberry Roan."

"Then he (Fletcher) turned around and wrote 'The Castration of the Strawberry Roan,' which is wicked," Black said. "I love it

when somebody is willing to pull their own leg."

Baxter remains a humble country boy, unpretentious and unimpressed with the bright lights of stardom. He recalls with fondness his 10 years working as a veterinarian in Grand View, and his travels to small towns throughout the Magic Valley. "I'd rather do a night in Bliss than the Tonight Show," he said frankly. "I'm more at home with country people. They're just my kind of folks. The feeling I have with those kind of people is the reason I do what I do. It's not like Hollywood and it's not like Nashville."

Black has lived at his ranch in Colorado since 1980. He and his wife, Cindy Lou, have a daughter, 15, and an 18-month-old son.

"All I ever wanted to do was be in the cow business and I am, in a way," he said. "I enjoyed being a vet. I never planned on doing anything else."

In his first novel, "Hey Cowboy, Wanna Get Lucky?," Black spins a tale of two bullriders, Lick and Cody, traveling the rodeo road. In their daily tiffs, tangles and triumphs, by the month of June this pair is still "a congressman's salary away" from qualifying for the National Finals Rodeo in December.

In bookstores since August, "Hey Cowboy..." already is in its eighth printing.

In its forward, Black promises his book will provide "a modest smattering of sex, violence, intrigue and the occasional philosophical observation."

Backbeat

Jerky Boys reach out and touch a lot of people

Hey, Jerky! Actually, it's The Jerky Boys, Kamal Ahmed and Johnny Brennan (in center with the happy faces). The duo have gone from phone pranksters to makers of two comedy albums to motion-picture stars.

33 five years older than Ahmed. "... I was shy, but I'd always get myself in trouble."

Shyness is certainly not in Brennan's characters. He may be the voice of perpetual hypochondriac Sol Rosenberg, but he's also the motor mouth for Frank Rizzo, the overly aggressive, obviously rude wise guy who has popularized such Jerky terms of endearment as "sizzle chest," "fruitcake" and "liver lips."

The movie revolves around the Jerky Boys — Johnny B. and Kamal — and the various character voices they invent. It's Rizzo who sets the movie's events in motion: He entrags the mob, the police and Johnny B.'s poor mother, who regularly, and rightfully,

smacks them both upside the head.

In the movie and on the records, Ahmed's great character is Tarbash the Egyptian Magician, whose act tends to be hyperbolically over the top. ("I stab customers in the eye with a siber," he brags; to one stunned club booker.) Brennan's creations are generally in-your-face (or ear, as it were); Ahmed's characters are often hapless and much put-upon, and he has a way of making their psychic pain palpable, particularly when he adopts an Indian-style accent (Ahmed's father is from Bangladesh, his mother from Trinidad).

According to Ahmed, Queens proved the ideal breeding ground for the Jerky Boys' beehive of voices and

attitudes. "It's so multiethnic and you have friends from all different persuasions..."

"And if you have a good ear, you suck everything in like a sponge and it stays with you," Brennan adds. "It was always there, and one day..."

Brennan, who ran his own water-proofing and roof-repair business, had a tape recorder and a speaker phone he'd gotten as a gift. One day, as he was looking through the paper for a pickup truck, he was hit by the bolt of mischief. He made a prank call, using what would become the voice of Frank Rizzo, and "that's how it started. I did the first 10 calls by myself and one night Kamal came over. He was laughing his (butt) off, and so we kept doing

them." Soon, a system was in place, along with certain rules.

"We only call businesses and we never get silly by calling the police or fire or anything like that," Ahmed insists. "When you call people at their home, that's a different thing. You could scare somebody or freak someone out. If you're at the job... you don't take it personally. You don't think someone calling has singled you out."

They tape surreptitiously (it's legal to tape people in New York without telling them), then seek out their victims to sign releases. "It's like a ' Candid Camera ' thing," says Brennan. " People sometimes freak out, but 99 percent of the people sign the releases."

The Jerky Boys had to make financial settlements with several people whose voices were included on the first album without their permission. (Last January, Lou Gatanas, who calls himself an original Jerky Boy, filed a \$12 million suit against Brennan, Ahmed and Select CEO Fred Munoz; the suit charges breach of fiduciary duty, contract interference and denial of potential profits. Gatanas claims he arranged the move to the mainstream and contributed to their first recording.)

The movie, scripted by James Melkonian with plenty of input from the Jerkys, is basically pranks and consequences. "People were amazed we could make a movie out of what we do," Brennan concedes. "... If we can make a movie about this, the possibilities are endless. Now we're thinking about doing a road movie."

Now that the film is out and there are public faces to attach to the prank calls, "I just hope when I walk the streets, rotten fruit and vegetables won't be thrown at me," says Ahmed.

"The minute the people stop laughing," says Brennan, "that's when you've got to get out."

Or, as the Jerky Boys might put it, that's when it time to hang up.

"But there's still so many people out there to call," says Brennan, ominously.

What's a guy to do after stepping down from a highly rated TV news anchor chair? How 'bout write a novel?

Longtime "Inside Edition" anchor Bill O'Reilly on Thursday shared details of his upcoming book, "Those Who Trespass: A Novel of Retribution."

It all seems to have a familiar ring. The tale revolves around a 40-year-old star newsmen, Shannon Michaels, who worked his way up the ladder to a high-visibility New York

City anchor spot. Michaels is riding high until a bitter TV exec fudges research reports to make it seem that Michaels is dropping in popularity. Shortly after, Michaels is fired.

Having been publicly humiliated, a brooding, resentful Michaels begins assassinating his television adversaries. Literally. Looking to solve the crimes, and stop the killings, are a resourceful up-and-coming newspaper reporter and a veteran NYPD detective.

Not only is O'Reilly shopping the half-written novel to New York publishers, he also has CAA

agent David Tenzer trying to ink a deal for a companion TV miniseries.

"There's nothing in the book that isn't true," said O'Reilly from L.A., where he's anchoring the top-rated newsmag because of the O.J. Simpson trial. "All the things in the book are things that I've seen." And, in many cases, he said, experienced. (Except, we presume, the brutal slayings.)

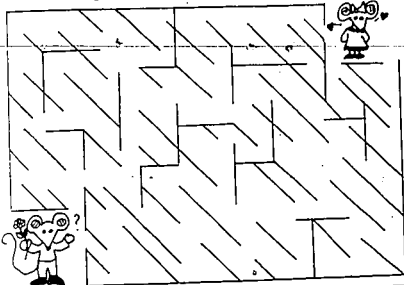

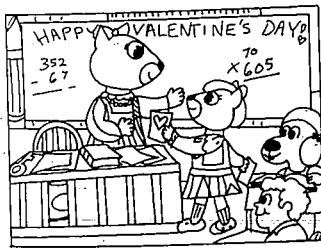

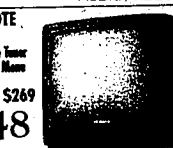
