Governor signs tax relief measure

BOISE — Flanked by Republican legislative leaders who made it their top priority, Gov. Phil Batt signed a bill into law Thursday that will reduce property taxes by \$40 million. "This bill grants Idaho taxpayers the largest property tax relief in Idaho history," Batt said during a signing ceremony in his office. "It fulfills my campaign promise to grant this relief within the first 90 days of my administration."

Idaho's first Republican governor in 24 years hailed lawmakers for enacting the plan that he contends in the long term will generate far more property tax relief by limiting local governments' ability to expand. Besides the permanent reduction from cutting the basic school district operating levy 25 percent, the \$40 million plan imposes a 3-percent cap on annual budget increases for property tax-financed governments — primarily cities and counties. Opponents fear Batt's plan will

provide only marginal relief for most taxpayers while hamstringing local governments trying to cope with growth, resulting in deteriorating services that might hurt expansion. Even its most ardent supporters in the Legislature did not dispute that just 30 percent of the reduction goes to resident homeowners. The rest — including an estimated \$4 million to out-of-staters owning vacation homes or property in Idaho resort areas — goes mainly to business and farmers.

"The critics of this tax relief say the average homeowner won't see a huge decrease in his or her property tax bill," Batt said during a signing ceremony in his office. "But what has been overlooked and underreported is that, for the first time in years, current Idaho property taxpayers will pay less taxes instead of significantly more." He said property tax increases were the most consistent complaint he heard while campaigning for governor.

Twin Falls firefighter takes a turn on 'Wheel of Fortune' tonight

TWIN FALLS — Sean Irwin is a city firefighter 24 hours a day, but for one half-hour tonight, he will be in the national spotlight as a game-show contestant on the "Wheel of Fortune."

Irwin, 24, is one of three players seeking fame and fortune on tonight's 6:30 show on KMYT-TV.

A faithful Wheel watcher since the days when Chuck Woolery hosted the word-puzzle game show, Irwin said it took him 1 1/2 years to get on the program. He got his chance in a September audition in Los Angeles.

"In a lot of ways, that was tougher than the actual show," Irwin said in a Thursday interview at Twin Falls Fire Station No. 3 on Washington Street South.

He and about 100 other "Wheel" hopefuls were grilled by show producers, had their pictures taken, worked over written word puzzles and were run through mock studio games. Fellow Twin Falls firefighter Dana Brown also made the trip but was not selected for the

show; Irwin was one of 12 who were.

He spent three days at Disneyworld in Orlando, Fla., for the show's taping in January. "I had a ball," he said. "I had the time of my life."

Irwin visited most of the local attractions until it was time to tape the big show with Pat Sajak and Vanna White. "I didn't meet them until I actually went on ... They keep them, kind of distant," he said.

He said he wasn't nervous during the show but felt an adrenaline rush when the cameras turned on and the show began. "What if I have a seizure? What if I fall down? A million things go through your head," he said. "I don't even remember what I really said."

He said contestants are kept well-informed during the show, with all of the

game information displayed in front of them. Players also get 15-minute breaks between puzzles, he said.

Irwin was reluctant to give away all of the details from tonight's show, but he still is waiting for some lovely parting gifts, which include a \$500 Sony stereo and \$25 gift certificates for Campbell's Soup, Tyson Pot Pie, Permatheze Diet pills, Dissolve-it and Hooked on Phonics.

He also is waiting for his complimentary supply of Turtle Wax.

Gary O'Brien, a producer for the "Wheel of Fortune," said the odds are long that you'll get on the game show.

"We have tens of thousands of people who want to get on," he said.

Auditions are held in Los Angeles two to three times a year along with other, tryouts in cities where the show is being filmed.

"We judge their energy, personality and poise," O'Brien said.

Contestants who do well on paper don't necessarily shine when put under the studio lights, he said. The standouts get their shot to spin the wheel for real on TV.

Ally claims Fox waffles on fund use

TWIN FALLS — State Schools Superintendent Anne C. Fox may be backing away from her campaign pledges to reject federal school-reform money.

During her 1994 campaign, Fox repeatedly denounced Goals 2000, a federal program that encourages states to improve public education.

But one of Fox's staunchest allies during the 1994 campaign warns that Fox is waffling on her promise.

Kathy Thomsen, a leading opponent of federal education programs, said Fox promised her, during a one-hour long meeting at the State Education Department last week, that she would send Goals 2000 funds back to the federal government.

Goals 2000 would funnel more than \$400,000 federal dollars into Idaho school reform this year. Next year's allocation could top \$1.6 million.

The superintendent gave Thomsen a copy of a Jan. 24 memorandum from Deputy Attorney General Elaine Eberhart-Maki that said Fox can unilaterally withdraw Idaho from Goals 2000 and return the money.

But when Fox failed to go public with the memorandum, "I called her up (on a radio call-in program) and asked her if she's returning the first year funds and she said 'I'm waiting for a decision from my attorney,'" Thomsen said Wednesday. "Well, I know she's already got it," Thomsen added.

During the campaign, Fox said Idahoans are opposed to the program and cautioned that federal strings could be attached to the money. She also said it is inappropriate to take federal funds when the federal deficit is so large.

But Fox's Goals 2000 criticism softened considerably after her Nov. 8 election. And she has suggested, through Ombudsman Jack Kauffman, that she might accept Goals 2000 funds — even if the attorney general's office tells her it's OK to keep her campaign promise.

Asked Monday if she's heard from her attorney, Fox said, "I don't have a report on that." Later, she said a decision is just one week away.

She insisted her stand on Goals 2000 is the same as it was before Nov. 8.

"There's no change," Fox said. "I didn't say I'm reconsidering."

Reilly, Fox's director of communications, acknowledged Friday that Fox has received a green light to turn down the funds. But 23 days after Eberhart-Maki's memorandum, Fox is now looking for a second opinion on the subject.

2 Dems switch on amendment

WASHINGTON — In a setback for the balanced budget amendment, two Senate Democrats who had been supporters announced their opposition on Thursday.

They were Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle, D-S.D., and Sen. Jeff Bingaman, D-N.M.

Even so, supporters said they were on the verge of assembling the two-thirds majority of the Senate needed to send the constitutional amendment to the states for a ratification drive.

After nearly three weeks of debate, GOP and Democratic leaders agreed Thursday night to vote on final passage of the amendment Feb. 28. A Republican bid to

Comatose son awakens; mom rejoices

GREENBRAE, Calif. — Julie Christine thought she was losing her son when he slipped into a coma after being hit by a car two weeks ago.

Sitting next to his hospital bed, she sobbed and prepared for the worst.

"I looked up and I said, 'I love you,'" she said. Stunned, she watched as he mumbled back, "I love you."

"I define it as a miracle. That's my opinion as a mother," Christine said Thursday, recalling the moment Sunday night.

Dr. Merrill Nisam, critical care director at Marin General Hospital in Greenbrae, said 20-year-old John Martin's emergence from the coma was "pleasantly fortuitous, but it's not rare."

Martin, who could stand up with assistance

Thursday, faces months of rehabilitation. It probably will be at least a year before doctors know whether he will make a full recovery from his severe head injury, Nisam said.

Before his awakening, Martin had two brain operations; his medication had been withdrawn and a respirator had been shut off. That frightened his mother, although Nisam said Martin no longer needed the medication or respirator.

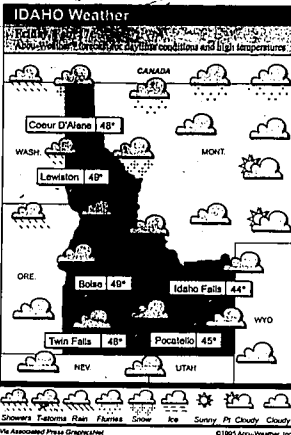
"It was the second time in as many months that Christine had rushed to the side of an injured child. She flew to North Carolina when her 23-year-old daughter, Eileen, was injured in a car crash on Christmas Day. The young woman recovered.

Martin had been back home in Novato, about 25 miles north of San Francisco, for a week and a half when disaster struck again.

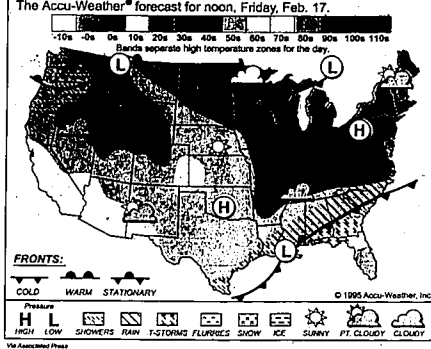

Cargo plane crashes on takeoff; 3 persons die

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — A DC-8 cargo plane crashed on takeoff at Kansas City International Airport Thursday night, killing all three people aboard, authorities said.

The plane, owned by Air Transport Inc., crashed about 7:33 p.m. MST near a runway, said Joe McBride, spokesman for the Kansas City Aviation Department.
A ball of flame had shot from an engine and the plane virtually stood on its tail before disappearing in flames down an embankment beside the runway, a witness said.
The plane appeared to get about 50 feet into the air, the witness said.

looking to "reconfirm" the earlier memo.
"She's not waffling. She's just following the proper procedures," Reilly said. Fox hopes to have a second memorandum prepared by a separate attorney and to draft a Goals 2000 "fact sheet" for the State Board of Education before she makes any decision, he said.
Fox will make her move after the Board's March meeting, Reilly said.
That's bad news for Goals 2000 opponents. Eberhart-Maki's memo said Fox appears to be the Board's agent on Goals 2000 — but the Board could "withdraw its designation of that authority."

Such a withdrawal could occur at the March meeting.
Thomsen and legislators, such as House Education Chairman Ron Blake, R-Twin Falls, and Senate Education Committee member Gary Schroeder, R-Moscow, say they have no idea what Fox will do with Goals 2000.
Schroeder, a Goals 2000 supporter, said Fox may wait until the Legislature is out of town, and then quietly cancel the federal programs.
The second-term senator has introduced legislation that would force Fox to accept Goals 2000.
"I think we can use it," Schroeder said.

curial debate fell three votes shy of the 60 needed on Thursday, but after hours of closed-door meetings, the two sides agreed to vote on a few more amendments and then move to final passage.
Daschle's announcement was expected, since he has been heavily involved in pressing Democratic demands to exempt Social Security from budget cuts and force Republicans to identify the spending cuts needed to ease the deficit.
"I support a balanced budget amendment, but I also share the belief that we owe it to the American people to tell them how we will do what the amendment requires," he said.
Noting Republican rejection of all changes proposed by Democrats, he said, "They are telling the American people to put their trust in good

intentions and to live with consequences that are yet unknown."
Bingaman reacted angrily this week when the Republican National Committee began airing television commercials in several states — New Mexico among them — designed to build support for the proposed amendment.
In a statement declaring his opposition, he made no mention of the commercials, focusing instead on Republican refusal to repeal a house rule requiring a three-fifths vote to raise income tax rates.
"This rule will ... protect the wealthy from increases in income taxes, while letting the working families of America see tax rates on all other taxes they pay — Social Security, Medicare, gas and excise taxes — carry the full burden of deficit reduction," Bingaman said.
Meanwhile, supporters held a made-for-camera event in a mid-rain outside the Capitol to dramatize their cause.
A giant tote board served as backdrop, with a 13-digit calculation of the nation's \$4.8 trillion debt showing the total going ever higher as roughly a dozen senators urged support for the amendment.
Sen. Paul Simon of Illinois, the leading Democratic supporter, predicted a "very, very close vote" when the roll is called. Sen. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, has said supporters have 66 of the 67 votes needed to win.
The proposed amendment would require a balanced budget in 2002, with a three-fifths vote of both houses of Congress required to run a deficit thereafter. A three-fifths majority also would be required to raise the debt limit.

IRS progress 'minimal' on modernizing

WASHINGTON (AP) — After spending eight years and \$2 billion, the Internal Revenue Service has made minimal progress toward bringing its antiquated computer systems into the 1990s, congressional auditors said Thursday.

"There remains a high risk that IRS will not complete its modernization program" promptly and cost-effectively, said Hazel E. Edwards of the General Accounting Office.
"If she would just do what she promised during the campaign — minus the architectural design in my opinion — she'd have a winning four years," McIntyre said.

WASHINGTON (AP) — A shipment of heating oil paid for by the Pentagon enabled North Korea to divert gasoline to its military forces along the South Korean border, the top U.S. general in South Korea said Thursday.
Army Gen. Gary Luck told the Senate Armed Services Committee that U.S. intelligence gathered detected a diversion of fuel. "We called their hand on that and they stopped doing it," he said.
Luck declined to go into detail in open session but suggested it would be easy enough for North Korea to shift its own petroleum resources around with the help of the U.S. shipment, which was made in late January.
North Korea and the United States agreed last fall to a "framework agreement" designed to halt North Korea's nuclear program in exchange for oil and, later, nuclear power plants. The first shipment of 50,000 tons of heavy oil was delivered to the communist North late last month. It was paid for with \$4.7 million drawn from a Pentagon account for "emergency and extraordinary" expenses.
"The engineering of that oil to begin with was supposed to be such that it could not be converted very readily into military use," Luck testified. "But if the heavy oil went to an oil-burning power plant, he said, they can convert what they were going to use (at that plant) into military use, so there probably is room to suspicion that."
"We're watching them pretty closely," the general added.
Over the next several years, the United States, along with South Korea and Japan, will provide North Korea with up to 500,000 tons of heavy oil per year, with the three countries sharing the cost. The idea was to compensate North Korea for electrical generating capacity lost when the Pyongyang government agreed to shut down one nuclear reactor and stop construction of two others.

Poll: Give Foster a chance in hearings

NEW YORK (AP) — About three in four Americans think Dr. Henry Foster Jr. deserves a full Senate hearing rather than having his nomination for surgeon general scuttled by the abortion issue, an Associated Press poll finds.

The Tennessee obstetrician-gynecologist faces a difficult fight for Senate confirmation after stumbling over disclosure of the number of abortions he has performed.

One-third of the 1,008 adults in the poll perceive a lack of truthfulness in Foster's inconsistent accounts. But more respondents, 43 percent, see innocent misstatements. The rest are not sure.

Nineteen percent say Foster's credibility has suffered so much that President Clinton should withdraw his nomination. In contrast, 73 percent say Foster deserves a full confirmation hearing. That could come next month, although Foster was already making his case by visiting senators Thursday.

An overwhelming 70 percent in the poll say the fact that Foster performed abortions should not disqualify him from serving as the nation's chief advocate for public health. Twenty-two percent say the abortions should disqualify him; 8 percent aren't sure.

The poll was taken Friday through Tuesday by ICR Survey Research Group of Media, Pa., part of AUS Consultants. Results have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.

Support for the nomination outstrips opposition by 36 percent to 22 percent, but 41 percent have no opinion. That includes 29 percent who volunteer that they do not have enough information yet.

Nearly half those who oppose Foster do not think he should be disqualified simply for performing abortions. And those who oppose legalized abortion still favor a full hearing for Foster, 49 percent to 44 percent.

Of those in the poll who generally favor abortion rights, Foster gets 45 percent support and only 14 percent opposition. He is opposed by 44 percent of those who think abortion should not be allowed.

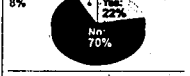
Sixty percent of abortion opponents think his involvement with the procedure disqualifies him.

Q: Do you support or oppose Dr. Henry Foster to be surgeon general?



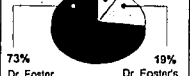
Q: Do you think the fact that Dr. Foster has performed abortions should disqualify him from serving as surgeon general?

Speaker concedes risk with reform

WASHINGTON (AP) — Some of the House Republicans' pro-assertions on federal regulators may, in fact, contribute to bureaucratic gridlock, Speaker Newt Gingrich acknowledged Thursday.

"One of the major concerns," Gingrich told an environmental forum, is that the proposed risk-assessment proposal might cause problems for business as well as regulators because it may be overly restrictive and wide-reaching.

Nevertheless, Gingrich said federal regulations must be revamped and made less burdensome and that House Republicans are committed to approving the legislation outlined in the "Contract With America" during the first 100 days of the Congress.

Any problems with risk assessment, he said, can be resolved when the Senate and House versions are reconciled.

Clinton administration officials and many environmental organi-

zations have argued that proposals being considered as part of the "Contract With America" agenda would hamstring federal health, safety and environmental regulations.

In some cases, compliance by businesses might become more, not less, burdensome, these critics have argued. For example, a company seeking approval for a new pharmaceutical product, might have to comply with additional cost-benefit and risk analyses. The same could apply to companies seeking pollution permits.

"That would be one of the major concerns," Gingrich said Thursday.

Conservative show host fired

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Just six weeks after he went on the air with anti-homosexual remarks and comments about AIDS that offended the gay community, KSFO's talk show host J. Paul Emerson has been fired.

Station management informed Emerson on Wednesday that he would not return to the air, Capital Cities spokeswoman Julie Hoover said.

Emerson was hired in January as part of the station's switch to an all conservative talk format called Hot Talk, an unexpected move in notoriously liberal San Francisco.

The change was an effort to boost consistently low ratings KSFO had with its previous lineup of progressive, female and minority talk show hosts. Instead, it won the station reams of negative publicity.

Most of the outcry has been the result of Emerson's morning drive-time comments, including statements that people with AIDS should be quarantined and that homosexuals are "sick" and "pathetic."

Administration turns up heat over wage issue

WASHINGTON (AP) — Labor Secretary Robert Reich accused congressional Republicans of being Robin Hoods in reverse Thursday and challenged their House leader to debate over raising the minimum wage.

Reich claimed that the House Republicans' "Contract With America" ignores working Americans and that almost half of its proposed \$725 billion tax cut would go to families earning more than \$100,000 a year.

"Republicans are now behaving like Robin Hood on rewin," he told a Labor Department Low Wage Workers Conference. "They're picking the pockets of the poor to pump up the purses of the prosperous."

Saying there are "tens of millions" of Americans working harder than ever before and barely making it, Reich urged adoption of President Clinton's proposal to boost the \$4.25 hourly minimum wage to \$5.15 over two years.

"Eleven million (workers) earn less than \$5.15 an hour," Reich told the conference. "Yet some Republicans ... still claim that they don't need a raise."

Opponents contend an increase would cause businesses to cut their work forces and thus result in lost jobs rather than greater incomes.

Tornado ravages Alabama towns

ARAB, Ala. (AP) — A pre-dawn tornado ripped across north Alabama Thursday, killing three people and injuring more than 100.

The dead, all in Arab, included a young child, Marshall County Coroner Dempsey Hibbs said.

At least one resident reported hearing no warning siren before the storm hit shortly after 5 a.m.

Less than an hour before that, lightning struck the office of the National Weather Service in nearby Huntsville, forcing its evacuation.

But a warning was issued shortly before the storm hit by the service's office in Birmingham.

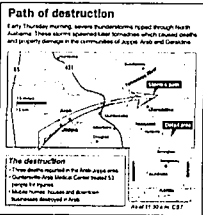
Karen Berry of Arab said "his roar woke me up," trees were flying through the air and the power went out.

"Normally they give us a siren warning, but they didn't this morning," she said. "There was nothing."

Officials at Guntersville-Arab Medical Center said 66 people were treated, with 13 admitted and four transferred to Huntsville for additional care. They said they knew of 40 other people taken to two other hospitals.

Farm buildings collapsed, metal buildings peeled open, trailers and homes were torn apart, and toys and furniture were strewn amid the rubble in the tornado's wake. Pink insulation was left hanging from trees.

Authorities said the tornado apparently hit a subdivision in the rural



community of Joppa, where about a dozen injuries were reported, and then hit Arab, some three miles to the east.

A roof blew off a section of an apartment complex in Arab, but authorities who searched the rubble found no injured people there. Robert Reynolds of the Arab Fire Department said there were other happy surprises amid the destruction.

"We found a 1-year-old baby under two trailers," he said. "He was sitting there, not making a sound."

The storm system also brought heavy rain and tornado warnings to parts of Mississippi and Georgia. Flooding caused problems, particularly in Mississippi, where several towns reported rainfall totals of more than 5 inches.

In Greenville, Miss., floodwater pushed into a number of homes and

businesses, forcing emergency crews to work throughout the night sand-bagging threatened areas. The small town of Sunflower also battled to stay ahead of rising waters.

In Georgia, a few residents of a mobile home park near Kennesaw, northwest of Atlanta, were evacuated this morning when a creek flooded. The area got nearly 2½ inches of rain in 24 hours.

4 soldiers die during exhausting training

EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. (AP) — Four soldiers died of exposure after struggling through chilly, chest-deep swamp waters in the last days of a two-month effort to become Army Rangers.

The soldiers, training to be among the Army's elite troops, had already undergone stressful testing in the forest, desert and mountains to prepare them for extreme conditions faced in warfare.

They had been out in the swampy grounds of Eglin Air Force Base in the Florida Panhandle since Saturday, and eight began suffering from hypothermia Wednesday. Hypothermia is caused by severe loss of body heat, leading to extreme fatigue, drowsiness, disorientation, and sometimes death.

Seven were taken to a clinic, where three of them died late Wednesday. The rescue effort was hampered by foggy weather. The body of the eighth was found about daybreak Thursday.

"Ranger training is ... one of the most difficult courses the Army offers," said Al Blanchard, a former Ranger and a spokesman at Fort Benning, Ga., Ranger headquarters.

"The whole course is designed to push the individual. There is very little sleep involved, a lot of stress.

It's not unusual for the individual to keep going on sheer guts."

Blanchard said he didn't know what the water temperature was, but "it doesn't have to be particularly cold to suffer from hypothermia."

The Florida Panhandle had warmed up after a cold snap with highs in the 40s and lows at or below freezing. The National Weather Service estimated that water temperatures for this time of year range in the mid to upper 50s.

The soldiers began boat training Wednesday morning and were patrolling in the swamps by mid-afternoon. They began building rope bridges as they moved into deeper waters.

At about 5:30 p.m., instructors noticed one student was showing signs of hypothermia, and by the time a helicopter arrived, several others started showing symptoms and were taken to a clinic, said officials at the 724-square-mile base.

Three of the survivors were in good condition and the fourth was listed as stable and in intensive care.

Names and home units of the soldiers were not released pending notification of relatives.

The deaths were being investigated by the Army Safety Office out of Fort Rucker, Ala.

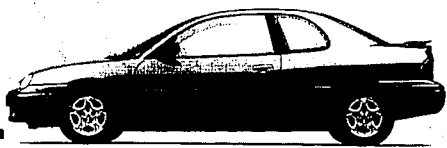

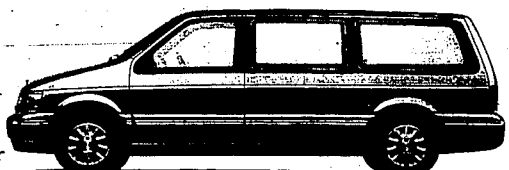

Experts take aim at lake's killer gas

YAOUNDE, Cameroon.— Convinced that another disaster lurks beneath Lake N'Gou, a team of experts begins a high-tech operation today to locate and eventually remove the deadly gas that emerged in 1986 to kill 1,746 villagers.

Jewish population in Germany soars

FRANKFURT, Germany — The number of Jews in Germany has risen more than 60 percent since 1989 due largely to immigration from eastern Europe, Jewish officials said Thursday.

EU suspends talks on aid to ex-colonies

BRUSSELS, Belgium — Talks on how much aid European countries will give 70 of their former colonies broke off Thursday less than an hour after they started.

The European Union, divided over the size of an aid package for the next five years, had nothing to offer in terms of money or trade agreements to the African, Caribbean and Pacific nations.

What was supposed to have been a two-day meeting opened, and closed, with Thursday's talks. The two groups are now expected to meet again in the spring, giving the EU time to agree on the size of the aid package.

Weapons disagreement grows worse

CAIRO, Egypt — In one of the worst rows in 16 years of peace with Israel, President Hosni Mubarak Thursday said Israel's suspected nuclear arsenal a threat to Egyptian national security and warned it could damage already tense relations.

Mubarak hastily called a news conference to blast Israel for criticizing Egypt's refusal to support renewing the Nuclear Nonproliferation Treaty unless Israel signs it. Egypt has urged other Arab countries to adopt a similar position.

Israel is secretive about its nuclear weapons program, but is believed to have about 300 warheads. It has refused to sign the non-proliferation treaty until there is a comprehensive peace in the region, citing the potential threat from Iraq, Libya or Iran.

Sealers attract expansion of hunt

HAVRE-AUBERT, Quebec — Sealers in the Gulf of St. Lawrence welcomed the Canadian government's decision to expand the seal hunt and said Thursday that activists who oppose it are killing small communities.

The government announced last week it will issue personal hunting licenses in an effort to slash the number of harp and gray seals blamed for depleting fish stocks off the east coast of Canada.

It will allow commercial and part-time sealers to kill 194,000 seals annually, compared to the current limit of 50,000. Fishermen who want to catch seals for food and those with big-game hunting licenses will be allowed to kill six seals a year.

Lawmaker voted Jewish agency head

JERUSALEM — A young, rebellious lawmaker pledged Thursday to strengthen the bonds between diverse Jewish communities after being chosen to head Israel's main link to world Jewry.

Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin's Labor Party elected Avraham Burg, 40, chairman of the quasi-governmental Jewish Agency, after a committee from world Jewish communities ruled out acting chairman Yehiel Leket for the job.

The party is hoping Burg, one of its most popular politicians, will revitalize an organization long criticized as a bureaucratic refuge for has-beens.

World's oldest person prepares to turn 120



Jeanne Calment turns 120 next week.

PARIS (AP) — "God must have forgotten me," Jeanne Calment is fond of saying.

The world's oldest living person is preparing to celebrate her 120th birthday on Tuesday.

"I've had a beautiful life," she said in an interview published Thursday in the newspaper Le Figaro. "With good health, one is happy."

"I'm still as hungry as a wolf. A 120-year-old stomach. ... What says more?"

Mrs. Calment, born Feb. 21, 1875, in the southwestern town of Arles, where she still lives, has outlasted her husband and her brother. Her daughter and grandson also are dead, and she has no direct descendants.

But she still has her memories. "I'm spoiled, spoiled," she told Le Figaro.

She remembers traveling to Paris and dining at the restaurant of the Eiffel Tower when it was still under construction. She once met Van Gogh, who worked in Arles. He died in 1890.

"Today, when I'm alone, I'm never bored because I revisit those magnificent times," she said. Hard of hearing and nearly blind,

Mrs. Calment has lived at a retirement home since 1985. She has had to use a wheelchair since fracturing her leg and elbow in a fall in 1990.

The Guinness Book of Records says Mrs. Calment is the oldest living person whose date of birth can be reliably authenticated. She became the doyenne in 1991 with the death of a 116-year-old American, Carry White.

Mrs. Calment says she has been forced to give up her two cigarettes a day and her single glass of port before meals. But she still smokes on chocolate, her passion, and sleeps "like a baby."

Arles is planning a birthday party for Mrs. Calment. She says she will wear a white dress, with small touches of black.

Yeltsin blames military for problems in Chechnya

MOSCOW (AP) — President Boris Yeltsin, looking somber but fit, defended his decision to send Russian soldiers to war in Chechnya and blamed his military leaders Thursday for the "big losses" and "human rights violations" in the breakaway southern republic.

It was Yeltsin's sharpest criticism yet of the military. Some analysts have predicted a high-level shakeup will follow.

Yeltsin, in his annual state of the nation address to a joint session of parliament, observed a moment of silence with lawmakers in the Kremlin's Marble Hall for victims of the Chechnya bloodshed.

"The fire of an armed mutiny has not been yet extinguished in the Chechen republic," Yeltsin said. "Russian soldiers fulfill their duty in the most difficult conditions there. People are still dying and suffering there."

The president's health and drinking habits have been the subject of renewed speculation. For many in the hall, his performance was at least as

interesting as what he had to say.

Yeltsin looked confident as he strode to the microphone to deliver the hourlong address. But he rarely looked up from his text and paused briefly at one point, apparently losing his place.

He sounded defensive, especially when explaining his economic and military policies to a largely unfriendly audience. Unlike previous addresses, there was no soaring rhetoric, no promises of better times ahead.

Lawmakers offered Yeltsin a cordly polite reception, giving him mild applause only when he completed his speech.

"The Russian president's address ... does not contain a single new word," Gennady Zyuganov, the leader of the Communist Party, said later.

Yeltsin reaffirmed his support for economic and political reforms, and urged lawmakers to sharply control state spending and curb inflation. He declared stabilizing the beleaguered ruble to be "the primary task."

We want you to know about young suspects

Those are the four suspects in the recent rampage of burglary and destruction across the Magic Valley. Publication of those names in a news story Thursday — and again here — should serve as a message to kids and their parents.

The message is this: Although Idaho law still protects underage criminal suspects from the harsh light of publicity, this newspaper no longer will routinely do so. When we find out the names of juvenile suspects in serious, high-profile crimes, we intend to let our readers know who they are.

That's a departure from how juveniles traditionally have been treated. Most states protect the names of juvenile offenders. The theory is, branding kids as criminals may harm attempts to straighten them out.

Most newspapers, this one included, have voluntarily gone along with that reasoning.

But Americans are taking a different view of juvenile crime these days. Juvenile offenders aren't just shoplifting and stealing hubcaps anymore. The recent local crime spree involved a gang of young criminals terrorizing innocent people, breaking into houses, and carrying and using guns.

The suspects' ages don't make much difference to the victims of those crimes. When your house is trashed, when your property is gone, and when your personal safety has

been threatened, you're not likely to be comforted by the knowledge that the perpetrators were too young to vote.

We think folks in our community have a right to know the identities of potentially dangerous people living among them — regardless of age.

As of December of last year, thanks to action by the state Legislature, some kinds of juvenile crime records will be made public. When a juvenile criminal is 14 or older, and when the crime would be a felony if committed by an adult, the young miscreant's name, offense and case disposition will be a public record.

That's a good step. But it's not enough in cases such as this month's crime spree. When a community has been outraged by vicious and violent crimes, we don't think people should have to wait for final court action before hearing the full details of the case.

We have always printed the names of adult criminal suspects, and from now on we intend to do the same in especially serious juvenile cases. Although the law says police can't identify juvenile suspects, it doesn't stop newspapers from investigating on our own.

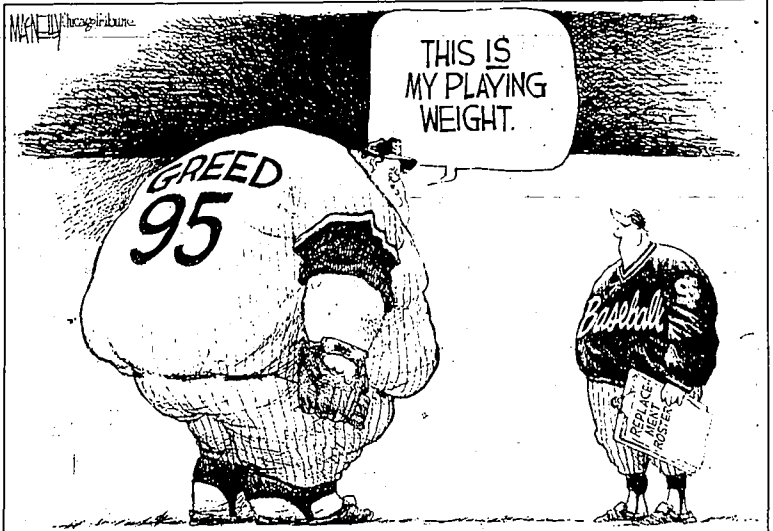
If we can track down the suspects' names, we'll share them with our readers. Readers can help us with that task, by calling us with tips.

We hope that printing these names will cause some youngsters to think twice about their behavior. Mostly, though, we hope it simply helps community residents protect themselves.

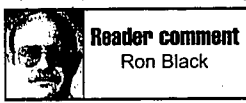
Legislator sets record straight on schools

I was deeply saddened by the sensationalism and tone of the articles which appeared Wednesday in *The Times-News*. While I understand that many times the headlines don't match the following article, both of these would have to be called, at the least, misleading.

Several days ago, I was called by the reporter to discuss the upcoming two-way, statewide interactive conference on the subject of school performance awards. This, as well as several other two-way interactive meetings with people around the state have been scheduled to allow input from people who cannot come to Boise. It is important that we get more local input into the legislative process, and this has been our effort to make it happen.

As part of the discussion about the subject of trying to reward successful schools like Morningside, the reporter asked why I was always referring to Lincoln Elementary in Nampa instead of a school in my own district. Either the reporter read more into the interview than I did or I didn't make myself very clear.

Lincoln Elementary has a very different approach to education than does Morningside. It doesn't use books in their math classes, has very strict discipline guidelines and treats all of its children as gifted and talented. Counselors are not used because of their disrupting influence on teaching in the classroom and on the students.



Morningside is an award-winning school with teachers and students who should be proud of their achievements. The two schools are different in their approach to education. One is not necessarily better than the other. It was just such differences the hearing was trying to explore.

I am not, as I expressed at the telecast, in a position of offering anybody money for anything! Our attempts at addressing the public concern of accountability for performance in our schools have brought a focus to the issue. Our committee efforts are to take input from principals, teachers and parents on what is excellence in our schools and how do we reward for that achievement. As part of that process, we have seen and repeatedly remarked on the fact that there are many positive things going on in our schools.

To return to the interview, I indicated that I had received calls from several constituents in my district expressing concerns about methods used to achieve the averages that Morningside reported in its test scores. These calls have occurred over the last six

months. The reporter used selective bits of my conversation. I have never said that "Morningside achieved high results in student testing by questionable practices." Those are the words of one person that called me. I believe that I made that quite clear in the interview.

While the charges made by these individuals have caused me to reflect on them on more than one occasion, my actions have not been to criticize Morningside School. I have discussed this concern with the State Department of Education last summer and, more recently, with Dr. Fox.

Legality doesn't make it right

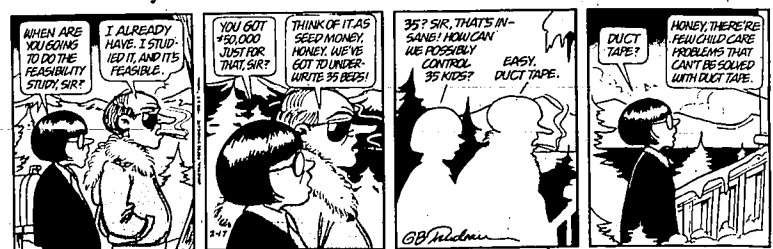

Simmering resentment axes Fish & Game TV program

BOISE (AP) — Simmering resentment of the Department of Fish and Game boiled over again Thursday among legislative budget writers who eliminated funding for the popular "Incredible Idaho" television program.



After heading off an attempt to salvage the program on a tie vote, the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee voted 11-7 to strip \$97,100 in sportsmen license fees from the budget that the relatively independent agency spends on the monthly show.

The program, produced in conjunction with KTVB-TV in Boise

and focusing on wildlife and scenic resources, is aired by stations in Boise, Twin Falls, Idaho Falls, Lewiston and Spokane, Wash.

The contract with KTVB-TV expires in June at the end of the existing budget year.

Republican Gov. Phil Batt supported the action. He criticized such

promotions in his State of the State address six weeks ago, calling them improper expenditures of public money that should be ended.

"I believe that there certainly needs to be sufficient public information about the Fish and Game and other state departments," Batt said after the committee vote. "But I think that we've allowed in some instances too much self-promotion to go on, and they put that one in that category."

KTVB-TV News Director Rod Gramer was not available for immediate comment, but state officials said the station had indicated it may

assume the entire financial burden for producing the show.

The dispute marked the budget committee's opening session on fashioning the state spending details for 1996. It had no impact on the limited general tax revenues budget writers have to augment Batt's conservative \$1.35 billion spending blueprint.

While in favor of the "Incredible Idaho" decision, the governor was less adamant about a second program called "Exploring Idaho" — produced and aired by KTVB-TV with about \$100,000 in cash from the hotel room tax funneled through

the Department of Commerce.

That program also is aired by the same stations in Boise, Twin Falls, Idaho Falls, Lewiston and Spokane. Like "Incredible Idaho," the rights to produce and air "Exploring Idaho" are awarded by bid, and officials said stations other than KTVB-TV had expressed interest.

Since he is philosophically opposed to government financing of essentially commercial enterprises, Batt acknowledged he would have to review that program as well when its contract expires next February.

However, he said, "The Department of Commerce is basical-

ly an advertising program for the state of Idaho, and that's their job to promote travel, to promote the assets of Idaho. I consider that to be a different matter."

Fish and Game's production was supported by some lawmakers who saw it as informative, instructive and a valuable alternative for what several called "the trash that is on" television.

After initially collaborating with Idaho Public Television on "Incredible Idaho," Fish and Game Director Jerry Conley said his department decided it could reach more viewers for less money on commercial TV.

GOP kills plan to limit campaign contributions

BOISE (AP) — Republicans on the House State Affairs Committee have killed an attempt to limit-state campaign contributions despite complaints from some legislators about the soaring cost of running for office.

On two 10-10 tie votes, the committee declined on Thursday to act on a bill sponsored by Rep. Jim Stoicheff, D-Sandpoint. It would have limited donations from each individual or group to \$5,000 per election cycle in statewide races and \$1,000 in legislative and local races.

The bill is dead unless two-thirds of the committee votes to revive it. All four Democrats on the panel voted to support Stoicheff's bill, along with six Republicans, mainly from rural areas.

"It's ridiculous how much money is being spent in campaigns," said

Rep. Gertrude Sutton, R-Midvale. "If this can slow that down, I'm for it."

But committee members from Ada and Canyon counties voted against it, arguing that it costs much more to campaign in more heavily populated areas than in rural areas.

"You never have any opposition. You don't know what it's about," Rep. Ruby Stone, R-Boise, told Stoicheff, who seldom has had an opponent in winning 12 legislative terms.

Rep. Mill Erhart, R-Boise, who ran unsuccessfully for governor and the U.S. Senate before winning a legislative seat last year, said the Stoicheff bill was more restrictive than federal limits.

Rep. Jesse Berain, R-Boise, said it would hit Republicans harder than Democrats since they have more primary election contests. But

Stoicheff cited the fact that 34 Republicans had no general election opposition for legislative seats last year.

Rep. Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley, said limits were needed to stop people like someone he knew "who has caused a lot of problems in the water community," and donated \$30,000 to a candidate in an attempt to buy influence.

Voting against the limits were Republicans Bill Deal and Ron Crane of Nampa; Berain, Stone, Erhart, Debbie Field and Paul Kjellander of Boise; Dorr, Tom Loetscher of Idaho Falls and Twila Hornbeck of Grangeville.

Committee members also objected to limiting contributions to \$5,000 for both the primary and general elections. Some members said they might support the bill if it allowed

\$5,000 donations for each election, or \$10,000 total.

"Five thousand is a pretty good-sized contribution. When you get above that, races are going to be bought," Stoicheff said. "You need to be getting your money from the working people, small farmers and the guy who has a shop on main street, not just the big dogs."

Stoicheff said his analysis shows that 22 Republicans, 22 Democrats and one independent would have had to return contributions last year if the donation limit had been in effect.

He said former Democratic Attorney General Larry EchoHawk, who lost the 1994 race for governor to Republican Phil Batt, would have had to return \$254,108 in donations and Batt would have had to turn down \$96,000.

Resident protests Weaver probe

BONNERS FERRY (AP) — A Boundary County man has asked a judge to overturn a decision to spend \$100,000 on a criminal investigation into a deadly 1992 standoff between a white supremacist and federal agents.

Prosecutor Randall Day and Sheriff Greg Sprungl have said state law requires the county to investigate the deaths of a U.S. marshal and two members of Randy Weaver's family near Naples in August 1992.

The commissioners last month appropriated the money to pay for the investigation. "I don't think it's productive and I don't think it's valuable for a small county like this to spend those kinds of bucks,"

Forest Service delays boat ban

A plan to keep powerboats off part of the Snake River through Hells Canyon three days a week has been yanked by the U.S. Forest Service, outraging environmentalists but leaving boaters relieved.

Dick Ferraro, deputy regional forester in Portland, granted the stay Wednesday. He said the river will be managed as it was in 1994.

"The stay will allow me to address and resolve appeal issues before any management changes take place," Ferraro said.

The action angered the 1,200-member Hells Canyon Preservation Council, an environmental-group based in Nampa, in 1994.

"We just feel like once again the Forest Service is caving in to the jet boaters," spokeswoman Marni Criley said.

Sandra F. Mitchell, executive director of the Hells Canyon Alliance in Boise, an advocate for

jet boaters, was jubilant.

"We applauded the Forest Service for coming to this decision," she said. "We know, also, this is one of many steps. It's not over by any means."

The plan released in November would have banned powerboats from 2 miles of the river for three days a week from July 4 through Labor Day. It would have applied to the canyon's widest segment between Wild Sheep Rapids and Kirkwood Bar.

The limitation would have been the first on powerboats within the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area since its designation by Congress in 1975.

The Forest Service had maintained that the three-days-per-week restriction would give powerboaters and whitewater rafters equal time on the river. However, the plan was unpopular with both groups and 31 appeals were filed, Ferraro said.

"There was a diverse spectrum of river users who appealed, including conservation groups, float boat

enthusiasts and powerboat users," he said. "Several of the appellants requested the stay."

The Hells Canyon Alliance charged that the plan would cripple business for most of the 19 incoming powerboat operators working in Hells Canyon and sharply reduce the number of launches available to private powerboaters. It convinced Idaho's state Land Board to join the opposition.

The plan was to have created the framework for management of the Hells Canyon segment of the Snake River for the next 10 to 15 years. Ferraro said the stay will remain in effect until a decision is reached on the appeals, and the plan can't go into effect until at least Sept. 16 — after the end of the upcoming summer's boating season.

Ric K. Bailey, executive director of the Hells Canyon Preservation Council, criticized the plan in November because it "arbitrarily perpetuates the domination of jet boats on the river."

Wallace woman dies in head-on collision

SILVERTON (AP) — Slippery road conditions caused a head-on collision Wednesday that killed a Wallace woman and injured a 17-year-old Wallace girl.

Patricia Hampton, 46, was driving a Toyota car westbound near Silverton at 3:40 p.m. when she lost control of the vehicle as it crossed railroad tracks and it spun into the path of an eastbound pickup, said Shoshone County Sheriff's Lt. Charles Angle.

Oliver Lunde, 80, Silverton, who was driving the pickup, suffered only minor injuries, Angle said. All three people were wearing seat belts and no alcohol was involved.

The woman was pronounced dead on the scene. According to a press release, the girl, a passenger in the car, was transported to Shoshone Medical Center and then flown by Medstar helicopter to Kootenai Medical Center where she was listed in stable condition. Police would not reveal the teen's identity.

Judge commits accused killer

POCATELLO (AP) — Bannock County Magistrate Ron Hart has ruled that accused murderer Augustus Joseph Isaak is dangerously mentally ill and cannot aid in his own defense.

Hart Thursday committed Isaak, 23, to a secure mental facility operated by the state Department of Corrections for a 90-day evaluation and treatment program.

A preliminary hearing for Isaak, charged with first-degree murder for the New Year's Day stabbing death of Jack Herridge, 53, of Pocatello, will be postponed until Isaak is mentally capable of assisting in his own defense, Hart ruled.

The magistrate based the commitment on mental evaluations submitted to the court by clinical psychologists Linda Hatzenbueher and Mark Corgiat. Both found Isaak to be mentally incompetent and dangerously ill.

Officials continue investigation into fire

TWIN FALLS — Fire officials still are trying to unravel the explosion that leveled a house last month and burned its resident. State Fire Marshal Donald Bailey has been combing the rubble at 232 Ash Street for the past two weeks, but his investigation is far from over, said Phillip Clough, commander of the Twin Falls Fire Department. Bailey hasn't yet been able to interview resident David Wilson, who was in critical but stable condition at the University of Utah Bum Center Thursday. The Jan. 31 explosion shattered neighbors' windows and threw pieces of the house into treecrofts. Investigators thought perhaps it was a gas leak, but they also have evidence of some sort of flammable liquid in Wilson's bedroom. Bailey has gathered portions of the concrete floor and burnt mattress for analysis, he said. The evidence must be analyzed by a laboratory, which could take several weeks, he said.

Hospital renovation prompts alteration of service hours

TWIN FALLS — Magic Valley Regional Medical Center patients with questions about their bills should call Business Services before 2 p.m. for the next three weeks. Renovation work on the medical center's second floor obstetrics department will affect Business Services for three weeks, and the business staff will be better able to respond to calls before 2 p.m.

Senate committee retracts controversial child-abuse bill

BOISE — The Senate Health and Welfare Committee has pulled back legislation critics warned would reverse progress made in recent years in the war against child abuse. The committee Wednesday agreed to drop most pieces of Chairman Grant Ipsen's legislative package in favor of putting a task force to work on the issue during the rest of this year. The legislation would have precluded state investigation of anonymous reports of suspected child abuse, subjected people making false reports to civil and criminal sanctions, required two doctors rather than one to corroborate abuse incidents, precluded children being removed from the home without parental notification and requires abuse allegations in divorce cases to be investigated within 30 days.

Ipsen maintained the legislation provided safeguards for the increasing number of adults falsely accused of abuse. But opponents claimed that the legislation would discourage people from reporting suspected instances of abuse and that any legitimate problems with false allegations could be resolved more acceptably.

Legislation levying fees for public documents endorsed

BOISE — Legislation allowing cities to set a fee for copying public documents has been endorsed by a Senate committee. The State Affairs Committee Wednesday voted 5-4 to give cities the authority by resolution to impose a fee up to 25 cents a page. Scott McDonald, director of the Association of Idaho Cities, indicated that the fee was prompted by requests from newspapers for huge numbers of documents that created personnel and financial problems for local governments. McDonald said there were more than isolated cases of newspapers running amok, and the fee would at least force them to narrow the scope of what he called fishing expeditions.

Critics of the bill, which still needs full Senate approval before going to the House, expressed concern that the imposition of the fee would be arbitrary and used to discourage access to public documents.

Man dies in sugar factory accident

TWIN FALLS — For the fifth time since 1985, an industrial accident has claimed the life of an Amalgamated Sugar Co. employee in Idaho. Michael Davis, 29, of Twin Falls, died in a noontime accident Thursday at the company's Twin Falls plant after his arm became trapped in conveyor belt machinery located underneath a sugar silo. Davis, a member of the cleaning room, appeared to be alone in the work area when the accident occurred. Lt. Bob Gauthier of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department investigated the accident Thursday afternoon. The

department has ruled out foul play. Davis was last seen shortly after noon, when his co-workers left for lunch. Gene Turley, Twin Falls county coroner, said Davis died of massive chest injuries at about 12:30 p.m. His body was discovered by co-workers returning from their lunch break. Amalgamated officials didn't comment on Davis' death. But Ryan Kuehmicel,

area director for the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, said OSHA has sent a staff member from Boise to investigate the accident. Davis is the second Amalgamated employee in six months to die at work. Juan M. Torres, 48, was buried alive inside a Nampa sugar silo last August. The last Twin Falls fatality occurred on Aug. 22, 1985 when 43-year-old Janet

Jones was crushed by a 300-pound piece of sugar inside a sugar silo. OSHA fined Amalgamated \$420 for violating safety standards. Despite the death, Ken Wiesmore, local president of the American Federation of Grainmillers, said the Twin Falls plant is a safe place to work. For the past five years, it has received awards for safety, and "Amalgamated has the lowest accident rate of anybody in the industry," Wiesmore said. Ironically, Amalgamated was offering "emergency response training" at the Weston Plaza when the accident occurred. "They put a lot of money and a lot of time into safety," Wiesmore said. "They try."

Court rules against ear surgery

BOISE — The Idaho Supreme Court affirmed Thursday an Idaho Department of Health and Welfare decision: Medicaid does not have to pay for cosmetic surgery to help raise a Rupert boy's self-esteem.

But the Twin Falls attorney who represented 9-year-old Jeremy Viveros said Thursday there now may be private fundraising efforts to pay for an operation to reduce and reshape Jeremy's protruding ears. Among other problems, Jeremy is developmentally delayed both psychologically and behaviorally, and his brain was damaged at birth.

Jeremy, who does not have hearing problems, was denied Medicaid coverage by Health and Welfare for the cosmetic

surgery, which the department deemed medically unnecessary. Fifth District Judge Daniel B. Meichl upheld the department's decision.

Attorney Michael F. McCarthy argued Jeremy's appeal case before Supreme Court justices last November, when they were in Twin Falls to hear nine cases. On Thursday, McCarthy said he had not seen the decision but would like to see if the justices adopted some definition of "medical necessity."

Jeremy's mother, Diana Viveros, was unavailable for comment Thursday, McCarthy said.

Diana Viveros took her son to Twin Falls plastic surgeon Dr. H. Peter Doble II about two years ago because Jeremy was being teased about his ears. Doble consulted with Twin Falls psychiatrist Dr. Richard W.

Worst and concluded cosmetic surgery is needed to preserve Jeremy's self-esteem, McCarthy had told the justices.

Deputy Attorney General James T. Baird, representing Health and Welfare, had said anyone could demand Medicaid pay for surgeries such as tummy tucks, breast reductions, hair transplants and liposuctions under that definition of "medically necessary." All could cause a person with low self-esteem to feel better, he told justices.

McCarthy, however, had said there would have to be a strong showing of "medically necessary" from a psychiatrist and physician before other such surgeries would have to be paid by Medicaid.

McCarthy said Thursday some people talked with him about fund-raising efforts for Jeremy after the Supreme Court appeal was heard.

Dress-code bill dies in committee

BOISE — The Idaho Legislature will not attempt to pass two bills dealing with dress codes for public school students and teachers.

The Senate Education Committee on Thursday killed two measures intended to strengthen and clarify the authority of local districts to impose dress codes. Sen. Rod Beck, R-Boise, was among committee members arguing that local school districts "don't need the state telling them to establish a dress code."

Sen. Robert Geddes Jr., R-Preston, was the only committee member supporting the dress code bills. He said dis-

tricts in his area favor them. "It would be a good support system for them to put a little more teeth into it," he said.

The bill to allow restrictions on students' clothing was sponsored by Sen. Denton Darrington, R-DeLo. Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, sponsored a bill to allow restrictions on teachers' clothing.

Education Committee Chairman John Hansen, R-Idaho Falls, said the bills were intended to clarify the enforcement authority of local districts. One would have allowed districts to cover students with dress standards and another was intended for teachers and other staff.

Hansen said although it would not be a mandate from the state, many districts would interpret the bills as a directive from the Legislature to enact and enforce tougher dress codes.

Sen. Gary Schroeder, R-Moscow, said he objected to the idea that the way a student dresses is a reflection of his or her character. "There is no relationship between dress and the quality of teaching," he said. "This is a step in the wrong direction."

"I'm not convinced we need to legislate this," said Sen. Judi Danielson, R-Council. However, turning to the school lobbyists at the hearing, she said, "If they don't address it, we will have to."

Energy Department budget may impede INEL cleanup

IDAHO FALLS — The U.S. Energy Department's contamination-clean-up motto is "On the Move," but budget constraints might put some projects on hold.

Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary has said her department may seek to renegotiate some deadlines if the new budget makes them impossible to meet. The agency, at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory and other sites, negotiated deadlines with host states three years ago.

Missing deadlines can leave the Energy Department open to state fines. At the INEL, officials say they still plan to meet the requirements, although they

are not ruling out new negotiations covering radioactive waste and hazardous materials.

The waste is buried and stored atop the eastern Snake River Plain Aquifer, which provides water for thousands of people in the Magic Valley.

"The proposed budget is going to be very challenging in that regard," spokesman Brad Bigger said. "As a last resort, DOE would go to the state and renegotiate."

The budget proposal, which has yet to be approved by Congress, gives \$84 million to the INEL for cleanup next year. That is about \$22 million short of what is needed if the Pit 9 project is included.

Pit 9 is an experimental project to

demonstrate new cleanup techniques at the Radioactive Waste Management Complex. The pit was used as a burial ground for plutonium-tainted debris struck to the site from Colorado decades ago.

"Pit 9 is a priority," Bigger said, and managers will look to take money from other INEL divisions to get the cleanup there done on time.

Under a consent agreement signed by state officials, a number of studies to determine the extent of cleanup necessary are to be completed this year. Excavation already has started on deadline at Pit 9, but additional milestones must be reached this year and in 1996.

Dean Nygard, who oversees federal com-

pliance for the Idaho Division of Environmental Quality, said he assumes everything will move ahead as planned.

"So far the money has been there," he said. However, "it gets a little more difficult every year."

Nygard said he was unsure what the state would do if the Energy Department cannot find the money to keep its word.

"It creates an array of legal problems that I really don't feel comfortable getting into," he said.

But he said state officials are concerned about the prospect of cleanup delays, especially since projects like Pit 9 are moving beyond study and into more costly design and actual cleanup.

Kimberly appoints new mayor

KIMBERLY — This week, the City Council appointed a new mayor — filling the empty seat for the second time in less than a year — while chastising another mayoral applicant for leading a campaign against city officials.

Jim Sorensen, who teaches agriculture at Kimberly High School, was sworn in Tuesday, after the council unanimously approved his appointment. Sorensen, 47, has lived and taught in Kimberly for 25 years.

The Kimberly city government has been in a state of flux since the resignation of Mayor Jesse Posey 13 months ago. Councilman George McAdams was appointed mayor in March of last year and resigned several weeks ago. In addition, there have been two vacancies on the city council, making Sorensen the fourth appointment to the city government in the past year.

Kimberly resident Betty Murray, who waged a strong but unsuccessful write-in campaign for City Council in November of 1993, was considered by the council to fill each vacancy since Posey's resignation. But this week Murray was passed over for the fourth time.

Murray became known in town for her open criticism of city officials, as she built a campaign platform on what she called the need to clean up city government and the police department.

But according to Councilman David Overacre, Murray took her assault on the city too far.

Tuesday, Overacre rebuked Murray's tactics, charging her with staging a campaign to make city officials look bad through a series of letters to the editor from town residents, published in *The Times-News*.

Several of the letters were not written by the people who signed them, Overacre said, but were either written by Murray herself, or were written under Murray's direction.

But Ms. Murray has been malicious in her attempt to cast an unfavorable image on our community and has made inflammatory statements against the city for her own personal ambitions," Overacre said. "I feel the citizens of this community have been lied to, and deserve an apology, from Ms. Murray. Her propaganda campaign has hurt a lot of people."

But Murray denied Overacre's accusations that evening, saying that she did not write any letters to the editor other than those she signed herself.

Murray did confirm, however, that one particular letter to the editor was not written by the woman who signed it. Murray said she delivered the letter to the woman to get her signature on it.

Overacre said Wednesday that he did not confront Murray with the intent to end her political career before it began.

But, he said, "it was important to me that this information come out, that the council have this information so that they could make a decision on appointing a mayor."

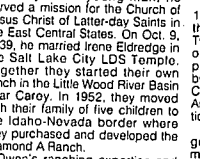

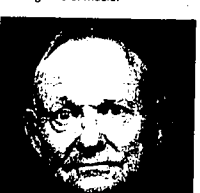

Fish service seeks extension on submission of salmon plan

PORTLAND (AP) — The U.S. Justice Department asked a federal judge Thursday for a one-week extension of the deadline for submitting a plan for operating the Columbia-Snake hydropower system to help salmon survive.

The government acted at the request of the National Marine Fisheries Service, which said it needed more time to develop the final proposal.

Justice Dept. Judge Malcolm Marsh had set Feb. 22 as the deadline for submitting the plan, known as a biological opinion. The Justice Department asked that the deadline be extended to March 1.

Marsh ordered the federal fishery agency to develop the plan after finding that its 1993 biological opinion was inadequate to help endangered Snake River chinook and cookeen runs recover.

Brian Gorman, spokesman for the NMFS regional office in Seattle, said his agency needed more time to review the comments it received on its draft proposal. The deadline for receiving those comments was Feb. 10.

The agency's draft proposal called for fire from all sites. Utilities and industries felt it went too far in allowing water through the system's hydroelectric dams to help young salmon make it to the ocean.

State biologists, affected Indian tribes and environmental groups said it fell far short of what was needed to prevent the salmon runs from becoming extinct.

The draft plan calls for the drawdown of one Columbia River reservoir and the release of large amounts of water from flood-control dams on the upper reaches of the system.

The agency still will rely on barging young fish, however, an aspect of the plan severely criticized by the tribes and environmentalists.

Gorman said NMFS officials expect Marsh to go along with the extension request because all of the parties involved in the lawsuit agreed it was necessary. It would be the second extension granted by the judge.

The salmon issue is so complex that developing plans is taking more time than initially anticipated, Gorman said.

"It's a process that's fairly open and free-wheeling and that's fine," he said, "but it really puts the crunch on the staff once the comments are in."

The biological opinion will form the hydropower section of the recovery plan being developed by the fisheries service for the endangered Snake River spring-summer and fall chinook runs, as well as the sockeye run. The habitat chapter of that plan also should be ready by March 1.

But the entire draft recovery plan probably won't be finished until mid-March, he said.

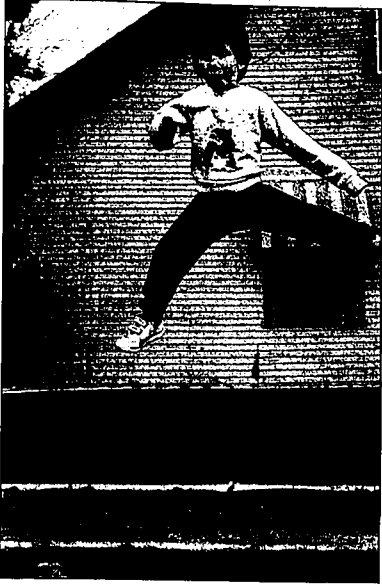

Minidoka gets 2 more officers

RUPERT — A federal grant will put two new officers on Minidoka County roads.
County Sheriff Paul Fries told Minidoka County commissioners he will get more than \$44,000 from the new Cops Fast program. Another available grant would provide the needed equipment for the new officers.
The commissioners upheld a permit for a dairy issued by the county planning and zoning commission.
The permit for Barry Peterson's dairy was appealed by Blas

Martinez who was refused a permit to build within 1,000 feet of the dairy.
In question was the Livestock Containment Ordinance passed by the commissioners several years ago restricting new home construction near any livestock operation licensed by the county.
Attorney Kent Fletcher, representing the Peterson dairy, told the commissioners the dairy had met all of the requirements of the county planning and zoning commission.
David Pena, attorney for Martinez, told commissioners the appeal was brought because the Martinez family was not told about

the 1,000-foot restriction when the acreage was sold to them.
"I would not object to smells from the dairy. I have worked on them and understand what happens," Martinez said.
Paul Aston, planning officer for the county, told the commissioners the application for the livestock operation was filed in March and Martinez did not buy the property until May.
Commission Chairman John Rensberg said his concern was to maintain separation between areas dairies and homes. The commission accepted the ruling of planning and zoning.

Olympic torch will travel through town

RUPERT — Magic Valley police officers are getting ready to carry a torch for the Summer Special Olympics.
Officers will carry the torch from Rupert to Burley and then to Twin Falls, said Lt. Lamont Johnston, a 22-year veteran of the Idaho State Police.
The local Law Enforcement Torch Run is part of a worldwide effort to raise money for the Special Olympics, he said.
From Twin Falls, the torch will be carried to Boise and then to Moscow, site of the Summer Special Olympics. Each agency

plans its own part of the run, but it is expected to begin about mid-May.
All money raised by Idaho law enforcement officers will remain in the state, Johnston said. About 1,200 Special Olympians will be involved statewide, including 173 in the Magic Valley.
Special Olympics are funded by donations.
All the games are modeled after the regular Olympics, with state, national and world competitions, Johnston said.
This year, the world Special Olympics will be June 25 through July 2 in New Haven, Conn., and the torch will be brought from Greece to be carried by various

law enforcement officers to the site. Johnson will be representing the state of Idaho to help carry the torch.
He said that \$8 million was raised last year and this torch run is the biggest grassroots organization for the Special Olympics.
Johnston became involved as a runner for officers about seven years ago and was asked to help raise funds three years ago.
A trip to a world-planning conference in New Jersey two years ago really gave him a better idea of the scope of this project, he said.
"This was a great experience, and I realize what this torch run can do," Johnston said.

County plans to help with animal shelter

RUPERT — Minidoka County offered its support this week to help cities in the county fund an animal pound.
After more than a year without an animal shelter, officials in Minidoka County agreed this week on a site in the northwest corner of Paul and will meet Tuesday to draw up plans, said Bill Rickett, a member of Rupert's planning and zoning commission.
According to Commissioner John Rensberg, the county agreed to support the joint effort because the cities have backed off from a more expensive proposal.
"The bone of contention in the past was they wanted the county to share in a more elaborate facility," Rensberg said.
He reiterated a county plan in a meeting at Rupert City Council chambers Monday that the county would pick up 51 percent of construction costs and would ask cities to pay for the rest. Under Rensberg's proposal, the county would pay \$150 a month in operating costs for the pound.
A former proposal called for \$75,000 in building materials alone, Rensberg said.
"The commission questions even

now if we should have a dog pound, because we can take dogs to Burley for a fraction of the cost," Rensberg said.
It costs the county \$5 per dog to use the Burley Animal Shelter, according to Duane Smith, Minidoka County Clerk. County dog catchers took 22 dogs to Burley in December, Smith said. That totals \$110 for the month.
Rickett said that a committee will meet Tuesday in the county building and zoning office to come up with a proposal to present to cities and counties.
The best option at this point is to have someone build the pound and then lease it to the county and cities, Rickett said. Details about who would gain ownership of the pound when the building is paid for still needs to be decided, he said.

Arizona man convicted on drug charges

BURLEY — A man found guilty of dealing drugs this week is the fourth to be convicted of 12 men arrested last fall on charges of selling drugs.
Jesus Bujanda-Velasquez, 27, of Arizona, was convicted of delivering marijuana by a Cassia County jury Wednesday evening.
The jury deliberated little more than an hour after a two-day trial, according to 5th District Judge George Granata Jr. Velasquez will be sentenced next month, Granata said.
Earlier this week, Jose Canelo, 23, of Rupert, was sentenced in Minidoka County by 5th District Judge Larry R. Duff to two to six years in prison and was ordered to pay \$1,128 in restitution. Canelo was convicted in January of delivering cocaine.
Two other men have been convicted and the remaining eight continue to work their way through the court system.

State plans new traffic signals, turn lanes

BURLEY — New traffic signals and right-turn lanes will be installed and constructed this spring at the intersection of Overland and Alfresco roads.
The Idaho Transportation Department has announced that the \$124,000 project will be completed by early summer by Gordon Paving Co. Inc. of Burley. The city also is contributing \$30,000 to the road work.
The new turn lanes at the Idaho 27 intersection at Alfresco Road will handle the increased traffic in the area and is expected to reduce the number of rear-end accidents at the intersection, the department said.
Minor delays are expected during construction, with traffic sometimes restricted to one lane.

Officer: Simpson never asked how Nicole died

LOS ANGELES (AP) — O.J. Simpson became upset and said, "Oh, my God, she's dead," when told by a detective over the phone that his ex-wife had been killed, but never asked how, when or where, the officer testified Thursday.

Defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr. said on the second day of the murder trial, he placed the call from Simpson's home to the hotel in Chicago where the former football star was staying on June 13, the morning after the slayings of Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ronald Goldman.

The detective said he introduced himself and told Simpson: "I have some bad news for you. Your ex-wife Nicole Simpson has been killed."

He said Simpson replied: "Oh, my God, Nicole is killed. Oh, my God, she's dead."

"And then he got very upset on the telephone," Phillips said. "He continued. He said he tried to calm Simpson down, telling him, 'Please try to get ahold of yourself.'"

Simpson said he would catch the next flight back to Los Angeles, then asked to talk to his daughter Arnelle, the detective said. Phillips said he handed her the phone. The 6:05 a.m.

call lasted about five minutes in all. Under questioning by prosecutor Marcia Clark, Phillips emphasized he used the word "killed," not "murdered," in the call.

Under cross-examination by defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr., Phillips defended investigators' decision to delay notifying the coroner's office for 6½ hours, when police regulations call for "immediate" notification.

"This is a black-and-white thing you're referring to, and I deal in the gray area out here," Phillips said. "When you walk out to a crime scene you just don't immediately turn around and make a phone call to the coroner's office."

He said he interpreted "immediate" to mean "as soon as practicable."

Detectives waited until about 6:50 a.m. to make their first call, which was only to notify the coroner's office of the deaths, not to ask that someone be sent immediately. About 8:10 a.m., Phillips called again.

Ultimately, someone from the coroner's office didn't arrive until 9:10 a.m. — about nine hours after police first reached the scene of the crime.

The defense contends that because of the delay, the coroner's office lost the opportunity to more closely fix the time of death. Prosecutors say the killings occurred about 10:15 p.m., which would have given Simpson time to get back to his house and clean up before leaving for Chicago around 11 p.m.

Defense attorney asks why coroner came late

Excerpts from testimony Thursday in the O.J. Simpson trial: (In the following segment, defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr. questions Detective Ron Phillips on the late arrival of a coroner to the crime scene on the morning of June 13.)

DEFENSE ATTORNEY JOHNIE COCHRAN JR.: Did you ever have any training or seminar as to what they meant about immediate notification?

DETECTIVE RON PHILLIPS: Well, I know what they're — they're referring to. But this is a black-and-white thing you're referring to. And I deal in the gray area out there. When you walk out to a crime scene, you just don't immediately turn around and make a phone call to the coroner's office. You have to see what you have. You have to investigate what you have. You have to talk to some certain people and so as soon as practicable, you immediately make that notification. It's not one of the first things you do when you get to a crime scene. It never has been, Mr. Cochran.

COCHRAN: But I'm talking to you about this change in the chief's office, November 17, 1993, which I believe you told us about because the coroner's office had some kind of complaint or concerns; is that correct?

PHILLIPS: I told you I wasn't aware of the complaints that were being made and I wasn't aware of the investigation. But I think the complaint was basically because we would call and then we would wait hours and hours and hours for a coroner's office to show up. So this was implemented so it would cut down on our delay time in waiting for a coroner and their time when they were going to arrive, so we would both work together to where we could get the coroner's office there at a time when we were ready for them.

COCHRAN: Would you agree with me that waiting from 12:15 to 6:50 in the morning, do you think that's immediate for the first call?

PHILLIPS: Well, no. But the circumstances out there dictated that. And as it says, as you read further on in this special order, why we waited further.

COCHRAN: I see. But you said the circumstances dictated. But if it impinges upon the ability of the coroner to do their job and somebody's freedom might also be determined.

DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY MARCIA CLARK: Objection, Your Honor.

COCHRAN: I'm trying to finish the question.

JUDGE LANCE ITO: It's argumentative.

COCHRAN: Well, let's see if I can restate it in a less argumentative fashion, Your Honor.

ITO: Thank you.

COCHRAN: If the coroner's not being notified affected the coroner in determining the cause of the time of death in a particular case, do you think that's pretty important circumstance?

PHILLIPS: If that occurred.

COCHRAN: And did you think that might be certainly more important than notifying the press relations officer downtown about the press crawling on the scene like ants? If you compared the two, do you think that would be more important?


PHILLIPS: Well, the coroner's office was notified, Mr. Cochran.

COCHRAN: I'm — No, I'm asking if you compared the press relations office and your concern with that, with the notification of the coroner, who could then come out and start a process by which he could perhaps with greater specificity determine the cause of death, wouldn't you think that's more important?


PHILLIPS: Well, it would be more important to have the coroner out there, sure, than it would be to notify the coroner — the press relations officer but —

COCHRAN: All right. You answered.

PHILLIPS: I did them both at the same time.

CSI performers craft Williams' 'Glass Menagerie' for February show

TWIN FALLS — Local audiences will be invited to journey into a realm of memories and illusions next week.

The College of Southern Idaho Drama Department's upcoming production will commemorate the 50th anniversary of Tennessee Williams' classic, "The Glass Menagerie." It's a memory play, jam-packed with illusions, and since its Broadway debut in 1945 it's been performed worldwide at least 10,000 times, by one estimate.

It's also been the subject of three movies, the most recent filmed by Paul Newman eight years ago, starring his wife, Joanne Woodward, and John Malkovich and Karen Allen.

The CSI production consists of flashbacks and attempted revivals of the past, said its director, Fran Tanner. It begins in the 1940s, with narrator Tom Wingfield recalling the late 1930s and fragments of his life with his mother and sister.

Like a fleeting memory, the play is not completely realistic. Tanner is using lighting and minimal set designs to suggest this.

The lights define the set, creating an illusion of reality, she said.

This illusion motif recurs throughout every aspect of the play.

Carrie Bonous, who plays Amanda Wingfield, the mother, sees her character as a faded southern belle, a woman who lives outside of reality.

"She is reliving the past to escape from the present," Bonous said.

In reality, however, Amanda's relived victories are simply a facade to help her look important for her kids, Bonous explained.

One day, Amanda decides that her disabled daughter, Laura (Autumn Haynes), must marry. In fact, Amanda decides much of her daughter's fate.

"I want you to make a wish on the moon," Amanda orders Laura at one dreamy instant.

Much of the play is performed inside the symbolism of Laura's glass collection.

The glass menagerie portrays the fragility of Laura's own life, said Morgan Williams, who plays Tom.

In the play, Tom truly loves his frail sister.

"They are the only ones that connect in their little world," Williams said.

But Tom's character also wants to escape from the confining, illusionary world around him.

"He's like any other rebellious teenager who's trying to find himself," Morgan Williams said.

In order to identify with his character, Morgan Williams said he drew upon emotions common to both his character and himself.

Bonous did the same with her character.

"These emotions are the saving grace," she said. "There isn't anyone who has not felt these at one time."

That may be why this play has been so popular for a half century and counting.

"Life repeats itself," Tanner said, who added that the play contains "great interest and universal appeal."

With the time-frame of the play sandwiched between the Great Depression and World War II, it is mostly about a

CSI professor wrote book on drama teaching

TWIN FALLS — When Fran Tanner teaches her beginning drama class at the College of Southern Idaho, she uses a textbook titled "Basic Drama Projects." She doesn't have to read it; she wrote it.

Tanner always wanted to be a drama teacher, and she second-guessed her goal so well that she has written three textbooks on her subject.

"Basic Drama Projects" was released last month in its sixth edition. Her other books are "Creative Communication," for the middle school, and "Readers Theatre," one of the few textbooks ever written on the subject.

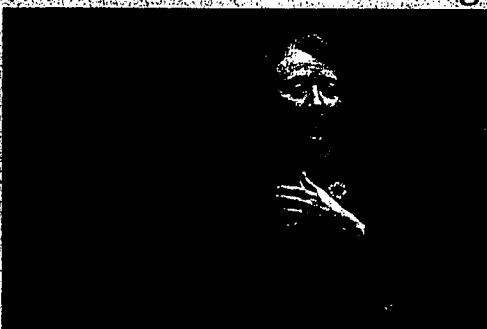
"I call them the Tanner trilogy," said Tanner, with a laugh.

These days, Tanner is the chairwoman of the CSI Drama and Speech Department. She's been at the school since 1965, one of the first faculty members hired when the junior college was brand new. She founded her own department, which now has three drama professors on staff. Next week, audiences will be treated to her production of Tennessee Williams' "The Glass Menagerie," a product of the techniques in her newly revised book.

She wrote the first version of "Basic Drama Projects" in 1966, shortly after she went on staff at CSI. She researched it using inter-library loans, because the college was too small to have a library back then. She sent pilot chapters to schools and asked for feedback. The whole process took about three years.

Since then, the book has been widely used across the United States and Canada. It's a staple of many community colleges, high schools and university teacher training programs.

"One of my college professors felt the

need for this type of book," Tanner said. "That's where I got the idea."

It's a hands-on volume, outlining lots of projects for the systems. It covers everything from production to stage make-up to costumes to theater history, appreciation and behavior.

"The new edition contains updates of sources, information on new videotape titles, new safety features for the theater and new scenes to try. It also contains photographs of CSI productions through the years."

Tanner does most of her writing during summer break.

The only child of businessman Bud and homemaker Lois Averett, Tanner was born and raised in Twin Falls. Her parents are deceased, as is her husband. Her children and grandchildren are scattered across the country.

So are her former students, some of whom are performing in repertory theater, TV or film.

Tanner, herself, said she never had any dreams of stardom and hasn't been on stage since college.

"But a good (drama) teacher performs every day in class," she said.

Sent to England as a Fulbright Scholar, Tanner earned her B.A. in theater and education at Idaho State University, her M.A. in speech at the University of Washington, and her Ph.D. in theater at Brigham Young University. She also has an A.L.D. (Associate of the Drama Board), with credentials to teach in England.

Through the years, she's been honored by the National Women of Achievement and Outstanding Education of America. She's an Idaho Distinguished Citizen, often serving on theater boards and directing productions in various cities.

In 1993, she received the Professional Achievement Award from ISU and the Academic Teaching Excellence Award from CSI.

Someday, she said, she wants to travel more, spend more time overseas — see, and study, more plays.

Take a trip to Hagerman — it's really for the birds

HAGERMAN — It's impossible to count the wintertime population of birds in the Hagerman Valley, but groups that tried last year in one day tallied 60,000 birds in 88 species.

With so much bird activity, the local Chamber of Commerce is promoting the valley's feathered scenery with its second annual Hagerman Valley Bird Festival, being held today, Saturday and Sunday.

"We've got some great speakers this year," said Terry Prince, secretary for the chamber. "We cover both the birders (watchers) and the hunters."

The headline this year, she said, is Morland Nelson, an Idaho native who is among the world's leading authorities on raptors.

"He's been on PBS, Disney Channel, Discovery Channel," Prince said. "He goes all over. He's the norm of the country this time of year. We just lucked out."

Nelson, who will give his presentation on Saturday at 7 p.m. at the American Legion Hall, travels the world to help with the conservation of raptors and other birds. In Idaho, he was instrumental in establishing the Birds of Prey Refuge south of Kuna near Swon Falls Dam. That refuge along the Snake River now retains the largest concentrations of eagles, hawks and prairie falcons anywhere on earth.

The opening show before Nelson features Pat Smith, who has expertise in taking care of injured birds. She will have a great horned owl and other live birds for people to see, Prince said.

Another highlight of the bird festival will be the hunting dog demonstration presented Saturday at 1 p.m. by the Idaho Retriever Club.

"They'll have trainers, hunters and breeders there at City Park," Prince said. "They had a real good show last year. Those dogs are fantastic."

Tonight from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m., visitors are invited to prowling around the Thousand Springs Nature Conservancy to see the owls that nest here to raise their young.

"They just might appear and disappear," preserve manager Chris O'Brien said. "They're a lot more common than people think."

The smaller screech owls, which usually make their home in the old dairy barn, O'Brien said, and they are the easiest to find.

"The barn owls should be called screech owls, because they make all kinds of hellacious sounds," she said. "I see individuals, but I have no idea how many are here. I suspect they nest in the cliffs."

The third and largest variety here is the great horned owl, O'Brien said, and at least two pair are now nesting at the preserve. The horned owls, she added, are the ones that hoot, and they are active just after dusk or just before dawn.

O'Brien said maps to the conservancy are available at the NPS visitors center in Hagerman, or people can call her for directions at 536-6797.

Bird watchers who take the morning tours this weekend might see northern harriers, sparrow hawks or curlews with long, curved beaks.

"There's a pretty good diversity of critters here," said Bob Willhite, chief ranger at the Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument.

family's "groping and grasping for a place in this world," Tanner said.

In one monologue, Tom alludes to "rust" being more destructive than "bombardment." Tanner compared this to Henry David Thoreau's quotation, "Many spend their lives in quiet desperation," the rust being the quiet desperation that eats away at the characters.

"The Glass Menagerie" is semi-autobiographical. In fact, Tennessee Williams gave his play's main character — Tom Wingfield — his initials.

In this play, the author defines himself as he looks back," Tanner said.

He had tried to erase the memories, but couldn't. Williams, who after Eugene O'Neill is the most celebrated American playwright of the 20th century, spent his life writing about weak women, their dominating mothers and strong, unscrupulous men.

To breathe life into the characters of "The Glass Menagerie" is a challenge, Tanner said. And, with only four characters in the cast, there are lots of lines to memorize and plenty of character analysis to accomplish. (The fourth character in the cast is Jim, the gentleman caller, played by Erman Jones.)

Tanner said the cast is using emotional recall to develop unique personalities in their characters.

They're also using their surroundings.

In Room 119 of CSI's Fine Arts Building, where the play is performed, the audience is close to the actors, making it easier to empathize with the characters.

As its members of the audience involve themselves in this play, they also involve themselves in the battle: illusion versus reality. And a new paradox unfolds.

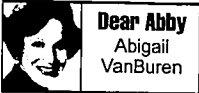

If the phrases "Marcia, Marcia, Marcia!" and "Oh, my nose!" hold no significance for you, you meet the first set of criteria indicating you should stay away from "The Brady Bunch Movie."

If you remember the 1969-74 situation comedy, but can't imagine why anyone would spend time or money launching it onto the big screen, nothing in the film will change your mind.

That leaves those of us who, through the mind-numbing magic of after-school reruns, literally grew up with this fictional clan of three boys, three girls, two parents, a maid and, sometimes, a dog. We couldn't always identify with the tambourine-banging antics of life on the road with the Partridges, but many experiences of the Brady kids comically hit home with '70s suburban youth.

"The Brady Bunch Movie" does a campy — and eerie — job of re-creating the show's characters and sets, but largely just plunders old episodes for its gags, story (what story there is) and sub-plots.

The movie's culture-clash premise has the action taking place today, but with the Bradys just as they were in the early '70s: constantly smiling, attired in bell-bottoms, spouting exclamations like "Groovy!" and "Far out!" Eldest son Greg isn't threatening to come home with a pierced nipple; housekeeper Alice isn't whipping up low-fat, iced cappuccino for Brady parents Mike and Carol. Instead, teen vanity (Jan feels "invisibly goofy" wearing her glasses!) and dating protocol (Marcia inadvertently makes two dates for the same night!) preoccupy the Brady youth.

As the better picture has the Bradys fiercely holding on to their San Fernando Valley home despite some seriously overdue property taxes and neighborhood pressure to sell out to big business.

Something like "Wayne's World," for instance, didn't need much story to generate plenty of laughs. Indeed, screenwriters of that 1991 hit worked on "The Brady Bunch Movie."

But like middle-sister Jan strug-

gling for her identity, "The Brady Bunch Movie" isn't quite sure what it wants to be. And her arrogant, greedy land-developer husband!). The tone is uneven, the pace not punchy enough.

There is some fun seeing polyester-perfect re-creations of the characters. Christine Taylor's gleaming Marcia is a stand-out, and TV veterans Shelley Long and Gary Cole capture the parental flavor nicely. There are a few charming guest cameos from those you'd expect, too.

The film is funniest when it pushes the envelope, toying with silly scenarios that warped minds come up with after seeing those old

episodes one too many times. What if one of Marcia's female friends developed a crush on her? What if the Brady kids struck up one of their bubble-gum sing-alongs ... during a trip to Sears?

Inevitably, though, we're left pondering all the other possibilities for big-screen Bradys. What about a gritty, "NYPD Blue"-style take on the show? Or some "Forrest Gump" special effects enabling the nice, '70s Bradys to meet their evil, '90s dopplegangers?

Maybe those are ideas Sherwood Schwartz, producer of the show and movie, can apply to his next threat, er, project: "Gilligan's Island — The Movie."

gling for her identity, "The Brady Bunch Movie" isn't quite sure what it wants to be. There are a few "Airplane!"/"Naked Gun"-style gags, broad physical humor, sexual double-entendres more reminiscent of "Three's Company," and jokes of "The Firm" variety, but the characters (Hey, it's a titillating, alcoholic, sex-starved neighbor! And her arrogant, greedy land-developer husband!). The tone is uneven, the pace not punchy enough.

There is some fun seeing polyester-perfect re-creations of the characters. Christine Taylor's gleaming Marcia is a stand-out, and TV veterans Shelley Long and Gary Cole capture the parental flavor nicely. There are a few charming guest cameos from those you'd expect, too.

The film is funniest when it pushes the envelope, toying with silly scenarios that warped minds come up with after seeing those old

episodes one too many times. What if one of Marcia's female friends developed a crush on her? What if the Brady kids struck up one of their bubble-gum sing-alongs ... during a trip to Sears?

Inevitably, though, we're left pondering all the other possibilities for big-screen Bradys. What about a gritty, "NYPD Blue"-style take on the show? Or some "Forrest Gump" special effects enabling the nice, '70s Bradys to meet their evil, '90s doppelgangers?

Maybe those are ideas Sherwood Schwartz, producer of the show and movie, can apply to his next threat, or project: "Gilligan's Island — The Movie."

The bottom line for Brady fans: Despite potential cult appeal, "The Brady Bunch Movie" might simply leave you longing for the orange Formica and AstroTurf lawn of the original series. Crank up the VCR. (Twin Cinema)

'Just Cause:' Lots of light, little magic

Just by his presence, Sean Connery often lights up his movies. That shaggy Scottish machismo and wit he's had since the end of his Bond days give his pictures warmth, weight and solidity. And Laurence Fishburne, ever since he was a teen-ager (and a Larry), gives his movies a certain danger, a spark of uncertainty.

But try as they might, Connery and Fishburne can't put much light, spark, danger or even sense into "Just Cause." Initially interesting, this would-be thinking-man's mystery thriller, set in Miami and small-town Florida, runs right off the rails.

for a while, the movie seems to work fine. Connery plays Paul Armstrong, a renowned writer and Harvard law professor passionately opposed to the death penalty. And Fishburne plays Tony Brown, a back-

woods Florida detective so passionately in favor of it that he's apparently willing to shove his gun down a suspect's throat to railroad him to the electric chair.

called "Without a Cause." Or "Without a Clue." Or maybe "Just Because," which is a plausible screenwriter's answer to why everything here seems so nutty, why these writers loaded up their movie with preposterous twists and so-called surprises and crammed it so full of grabs from other films — from "Bad Day at Black Rock" to "Touch of Evil" to "The Silence of the Lambs" to "Cape Fear" — that it seems like a movie-thriller bargain sale.

Unfortunately the chaotic script says something. These days, if you think your cause is just, it may not count so matter that your story is senseless. (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

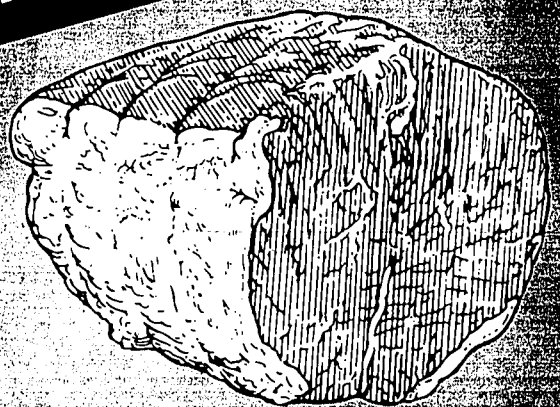

Fans take jaundiced view as baseball opens spring training

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. - On the first day of spring training, all the essential elements were there - players in pinstripes, a manager watching over them and temperatures hovering near 80 degrees with a cool, ocean breeze.

It was all so perfect Thursday as the New York Yankees opened camp, but it was all so wrong, too.

"Baseball was back, but it wasn't the real thing.

There were 27 players in Yankees uniforms, but they were not the real Yankees. They were low-

level minor leaguers and replacement players, not the heroes the fans wanted to see on this day usually anticipated more than any other once the World Series ends.

The real players were on strike for the 189th straight day, and 260 of them met with their union head in Orlando. No other formal workouts were held by the other 27 teams, although pitchers and catchers did report at several other training sites.

The fans stayed away, too.

At Fort Lauderdale Stadium, despite the free admission, row upon row of seats were empty. When

practice began, fewer than 50 people were there. The attendance topped out at about 75 an hour later.

Normally, a couple hundred would turn out for the opening of camp.

Hot dog vendors, souvenir vendors and security guards sat around talking to each other. Nobody asked the players for autographs because practically nobody had heard of any of these guys.

The manager and coaches went through the motions, watching players with far inferior skills.

Street posts fastest time in training

Tommy Moe, a specialist in the speed races - the downhill and super giant slalom, is skipping the Furano meet.

For the American team, that leaves the field to the technicians, all of them trying to catch Alberto Tomba of Italy, who has swept this season's seven slalom races so far and won three of five giant slaloms.

Olympic official likes Utah's chances
SALT LAKE CITY - A Canadian Olympic official told boosters of Salt Lake's 2002 Winter Games 'bid' what they wanted to hear - that Utah remains a strong candidate in the final round of the selection process.

"You're doing extraordinarily well," Roger Jackson, one of four original members of the 1988 Calgary Olympic Bid Committee, told Salt Lake Olympic Bid Committee fund-raising breakfast Thursday.

In a related matter, boosters of Utah's bid find themselves nearly a quarter of a million dollars short in fundraising.

Most of the money is needed to help cover the costs of planned visits to Salt Lake City by members of the International Olympic Committee, which is to choose the host city June 16 in Lausanne, Switzerland.

Officials of the privately funded Salt Lake Olympic Bid Committee are confident the business community will come up with the \$223,000 needed to meet this year's \$3.6 million budget.

More than 800 athletes from at least 44 countries - both records - begin competition in the nine-day Winter University Games Saturday at various sites around this winter resort in the Spanish Pyrenees.

"Knowing I'm going to be in the race is like having 28 tons off my shoulders," Marcis said. "I don't want to take anything away from Richard Petty, because I don't think I can do that. Dale Earnhardt has said it many times: Richard Petty is the king, and we all know that."

Marcis, the oldest driver in the field at 53, has led the 500 for a total of five laps. His best finishes were sixths in 1975 and 1978.

"This is how I make my living," said Marcis, who owns the Chevrolet Monte Carlo he races. "And I'm just here doing my job."

Marcis' streak began with the 1968 Daytona 500, his first NASCAR race.

Second-seeded Croat Goran Ivanisevic, a wild card entry, served 17 aces in a 7-6 (13-11), 6-4 victory over Frenchman Cedric Pioline.

Clinton: No pitch for replacements

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton, who out couldn't end the baseball strike, won't throw out the traditional first pitch on opening day if replacement players take the field.

Spring training began Thursday with talks between players and owners at a standstill. Owners have hired minor leaguers and retired players to be strikebreakers.

"He hasn't given it great thought, but it's impossible to imagine that he would throw out the first pitch of a game that didn't represent the best that major league baseball has to offer," press secretary Mike McCurry said.

Also, Thursday, the executive council of the American Federation of Teachers passed a resolution urging its members to boycott games with replacement players and not to watch them on television.

The council of the 875,000-member union also urged Congress to remove baseball's antitrust exemption and commended Baltimore Orioles owner Peter Angelos, who has refused to sign strikebreakers.

More signs economy slowing

WASHINGTON — There are new signals Federal Reserve-engineered interest rate increases are having their intended effect of slowing the nation's economy.

The Commerce Department reported Thursday housing starts plunged 9.8 percent in January, to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1.38 million, the biggest drop in a year. The weakness was seen in every region.

At the same time, the Labor Department said the number of newly laid-off American workers filing claims for unemployment benefits jumped by 20,000 to the highest level in a month.

Robert R. Davis, an economist with the Savings & Community Bankers of America, said the decline in hous-

ing construction "is not unique to that sector of the economy."

"I expect the rest of the economy to be moving down as well," he added. "The GDP will be well below 2 percent (at an annual rate) in the second half of the year."

The gross domestic product grew 4 percent in 1994, despite six interest rate increases. The Fed raised rates again last month, continuing its effort to slow the economy sufficiently to prevent any escalation in inflation.

The January drop in starts was the second monthly decline. They fell 0.6 percent in December, to a 1.53 million annual rate, after rising 5.9 percent during favorable building weather in November.

Michael Carliner, an economist with the National Association of Home Builders, said a survey of 358

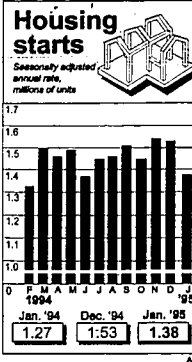
members earlier this month suggested the slowdown continued into February.

Twenty-seven percent characterized their sales as "poor" and 51 percent said they were "fair." Only 22 percent described them as "good."

Applications for buildings permits — often a barometer of future activity — also suggested further declines in the months ahead. They fell 8.6 percent to a 1.3 million rate.

Analysts attributed the weakness to higher mortgage rates. Thirty-year, fixed-rate loans averaged 9.15 percent in January, compared to about 7 percent a year earlier.

An increase from 7 percent to 9 percent would add \$209 to the monthly payment on a \$150,000 mortgage and price many prospective buyers out of the market.



AT&T unveils new plan to cut bill by about \$5

WASHINGTON — AT&T Corp., embroiled in a fierce battle with rivals for customers, proposed a new calling plan Thursday that could reduce the average residential customer's interstate bill by \$4.50, officials said.

The plan, which should be available April 1, would require people to enroll, but they would not have to pay a fee, said Joseph Nacchio, president of AT&T Consumer Communications Service.

The average residential interstate bill is about \$18 a month. A 25 percent discount through the plan

would save customers \$4.50, said AT&T spokesman John Skalko.

In addition, AT&T as early as this weekend plans to offer most of its 80 million residential customers a weekend of free calling. The promotion, which ends May 1, will let people make free calls to places they normally call on the weekends, Nacchio said.

The plans come as AT&T, MCI and Sprint are in an advertising war over whose rates are lower.

Last month both MCI and Sprint unveiled new plans to lure residential customers. The companies had no immediate comment on AT&T's latest plans.

Ruling could turn spotlight again on Microsoft

SEATTLE — Complaints about Microsoft Corp.'s hardball business tactics gained new momentum with a federal judge's decision Tuesday to quash a proposed antitrust settlement between the Redmond, Wash., computer software giant and the U.S. Justice Department.

Even the most cautious of observers characterized the decision as historic — for the government because U.S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin so boldly put down the Justice Department's work; for Microsoft because it could affect so many facets of the company's future, and for the software industry because it could result in a tighter rein on the largest software company in the world.

Sporkin's decision to reject the settlement reached last July, could force Microsoft into another round of interrogating over its dominance of the software industry.

The four-year investigation centered on complaints that Microsoft was using the clout of its MS-DOS operating system to squeeze money or concessions from hardware and software companies. MS-DOS — along with its Windows program, which allows the user to select visual images to issue MS-DOS

Government seeks speedy appeal to avert big increase in trials

WASHINGTON — The government contended Thursday it would be forced into costly trials against company after company unless an appeals court rapidly restores its antitrust settlement with Microsoft.

The Justice Department asked the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals here to move quickly to overrule District Judge Stanley Sporkin, who rejected the settlement Tuesday. Microsoft announced it would join the government in the appeal and abide by the settlement in the meantime.

Legal experts across the political spectrum predicted the appellate court would

overturn Sporkin's decision. Attorney General Janet Reno told her weekly news conference Thursday that Sporkin had overstepped his authority under the "Tummy Act" to decide whether the consent decree embodying the settlement would serve the public interest.

Consent decrees are court orders under which a company or other defendant denies violating any law but agrees to stop practices the government claims are illegal. Both sides avoid the high cost of a trial.

Only a handful of antitrust consent decrees have been rejected by judges, and appeals courts here and in California have overruled those judges in two cases.

But Sporkin ruled that the settlement was "too narrow," and neither side addressed his concern "that the decree be expanded to cover all of Microsoft's commercially marketed operating systems."

Sporkin said the government hadn't provided him with enough information to determine if the agreement was in the public interest. And the settlement lacks sufficient enforcement procedures, he said.

Sporkin has scheduled a hearing March 16, but no one seems to know what will take place then, or between now and then. In fact, industry insiders have been left to speculation, some even predicting an AT&T-like breakup of Microsoft.

Oppenheimer & Co., which had previously recommended buying Microsoft's stock, downgraded it to market performer. "From an investment standpoint, it reopens the entire legal risk associated with Microsoft all over again," said David Readerman of Montgomery Securities. "It introduces new uncertainties on the valuation of the stock."

THE ACES ON BRIDGE Bobby Wolff Large swings sometimes depend on seemingly small details.

"Thoughts, like fleas, jump from man to man. But they don't bite everybody."

"Why did you play the slam as you did?" asked the admiring killer. "I saw the reason for the spade finesse, but how can you have been sure of the position in clubs?"

"There were no sure things," was the reply. "However, often a defender's choice of opening lead can offer a strong clue."

South drew trumps in two rounds and led a spade to dummy's 10 and East's queen. (Had West held both the queen and jack of spades, the finesse would have cinched the slam.)

Searching for clues, South cashed dummy's high spades. Both defenders followed suit, revealing nothing, so he cashed his king and queen of clubs, dropping the 10 from East. When South's third club brought a low one from West, it was time for the crucial decision.

Did East start with J-10-4 of clubs or with 10-4? South guessed right and finessed dummy's nine. This picked up the suit and South's losing diamond went on dummy's club ace.

Why did South finesse in clubs instead of playing for the drop? His answer was a simple one. "West is a good player who would avoid leading a trump against a small slam. (It usually sacrifices a tempo for the defense.)

'Means' proves to be Field's days

"For years it had been brought up to me in my production office, and I would say, 'Can't be done, I don't see how to do it,'" says Sally Field.

The actress is talking about a film version of "A Woman of Independent Means," the bestselling 1978 novel by Elizabeth Forsythe Hailey. Finally produced as a miniseries for NBC, the film airs Sunday, Monday and Wednesday, Feb. 19, 20 and 22.

Written as a collection of letters, the novel has few descriptive passages and even less dialogue. Little wonder that Field and a dozen other would-be producers had trouble devising a way to bring it to the screen.

Even Hailey herself admits, "I wasn't sure how it could be done." Nevertheless, she says, the book "was optioned constantly from the time it was published." An option gives a producer the right to develop a book into a film within a set period of time; otherwise the rights revert to the author.

Producer Robert Greenwald ("The Burning Bed") made the final, successful bid. Then he called in writer Cindy Myers ("Incident in a Small Town") to perform the Herculean task of translating the novel into a teleplay.

Greenwald's actress of choice was Field, who won an Emmy Award for "Sybil" and Oscars for "Norma Rae" and "Places in the Heart." In hiring her, Greenwald acquired a production partner as well: Field is credited equally as star and executive producer of the six-hour NBC miniseries.

It's the sort of dual role the novel's main character would have insisted on herself.

Field plays Bess Steed

Garner, a character based on Hailey's grandmother. Ambitious, outspoken and rather spoiled, Bess inherits a sizable fortune from her mother when she is barely 20 years old, during the early years of the 20th century.

While fleshing out the novel's action, the film preserves its introspective aspect by including excerpts from Bess' letters.

Part 1 begins as Bess marries her childhood sweetheart, Rob Steed (Tony Goldwyn), nurturing by turns their children, her husband's career and the family's increasingly prominent place in Dallas and St. Louis society. Also figuring in their lives is Rob's steely mother (Oscar winner Brenda Fricker).

In Part 2, Bess is now a young widow trying to save her husband's company. Her champion and suitor is solicitous Arthur Fineman (Ron Silver), but Arthur is more interested in mar-

riage than she realizes, and he is finally accepted by her best friend, Totsie (Sheila McCarthy). Just as Arthur and Totsie are being married, tragedy again strikes Bess' family.

Part 3 presents the widest divergence from the novel, as Bess finds happiness with a second husband, Sam Garner (Jack Thompson), and only then loses her dotting father (Charles Durning) to old age. Later Bess and her grown daughter, Eleanor (Andrea Roth), become estranged, and namesake granddaughter Betsy (Brooke Hailey) finally helps them reconcile.

In the character of Bess, historical fiction meets casting poetry; actress Hailey is the author's daughter, and her character represents the author herself.

The film requires Field to age from the late teens to nearly 80, and the actress relished the challenge.

"The hardest part for me, the scariest part, was doing the young

stuff. The old stuff I loved. I loved exploring it."

Even with 176 costume changes, the extremes of age are a stretch for the 45-year-old actress, but Field's affection for her sometimes pushy and short-sighted character helps supply the deficit.

"(Bess is) certainly not a perfect person. She's very flawed, and I like that," Field says, adding that there have never been enough interesting roles for women her age.

"What happens to women when they're no longer of childbearing age? It's complicated, and I hope that it's my generation of (actresses) that slowly but surely is changing it."

"I'm certainly different at my age than my mother was at my age. But I think the most important thing is that age need not be relevant when you're telling compelling stories."

It's the sort of remark Bess would have liked.

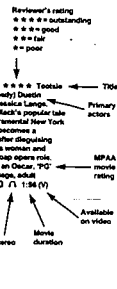

Q: Is Brooke Shields breaking up with Andre Agassi because he cut his hair? Is she really that immature? — M.P.

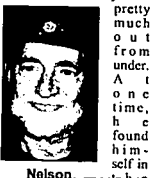

Under the new development in the lives of Mamie, John and his estranged wife Jill, Mamie's main concern was her suspicion of Jill's motives regarding Jill and John's child. There is a custody battle raging at the moment between John and Jill, and now Mamie has more reason than before to be wary of Jill.

"I love playing scenes with Jess Walton (Jill). She's a fine actress and gives you so much when you do a scene with her. I also feel strongly about Jerry, who as John Abbott has quite a following. People have approached me when they recognize me from the soap and they always ask about Jerry Douglas," Veronica says.

Veronica's background has been heavily involved with the stage, where she has played more flamboyant characters than Mamie. She says she clearly misses the stage but can't devote the kind of time needed to do a play and still continue on the daily soap. She is very excited about the recent turn of events on "Y&R" regarding her character and sees it as a jumping-off point that hopefully will break some barriers and allow viewers to examine their own feelings about interracial romance, rather than responsible adults rather than young characters.

What's up with that crazy bunch of Bradys?

On March 8, 1974, a sitcom that had riled no higher than 20th place during its five-year run aired its final original episode. Few Americans over the age of 16 noticed or cared: After all, this was a program the critics savaged and the mainstream press largely ignored. Newspaper TV columns carried neither eulogies nor appeals to save it from cancellation.

And why not? That show, "The Brady Bunch" would presumably be consigned to reruns or more likely to TV heaven. Life would go on.

If anyone had the vision to predict the show's fate in the next 20 years, come forth now and give us a hint on the price of IBM.

For rather than disappearing, "The Brady Bunch" became a touchstone for a generation, a show that has elbowed its way into the pantheon of cult TV shows. The original program spawned a Saturday-morning cartoon show, a 1977-78 variety hour, a 1981 spinoff ("The Brady Brides,") a 1988 TV movie ("A Very Brady Christmas") and a 1990 drama series. In 1991 and 1992, a stage production, "The Real Live Brady Bunch," re-created episodes word-for-word, packing houses in Chicago and New York.

And now, the big screen beckons. "The Brady Bunch Movie's" nominal plot may be the notion that the Bradys are still stuck in the '70s, although it's 1995, but the movie that opens Friday is essentially an 85-minute in-joke whose subplots are cobbled together from episodes of the original show.

Those clueless folks over 40 may be wondering how this happened. Why "The Brady Bunch" and not "Nanny and the Professor" or "The Courtship of Eddie's Father"?

Here are some reasons for the show's long appeal: —GOOD TIMING AND THE ECONOMICS OF THE TV BUSINESS. The darn show has never left the air. Each of the 117

episodes has been shown over and over daily for the last two decades. The explosion of cable outlets created a hunger for programming, and the show's wholesomeness made perfect after-school fare (in an era where racism, more topical sitcoms were being offered for syndication). Moreover, "The Brady Bunch" was in color, which was more desirable than the black-and-white wholesome sitcoms of the '50s. The constant reruns increased the show's fan base especially: They were watched not only by the show's original viewers, but

by their younger siblings, their younger siblings and by the children of the original viewers.

But what made this mass of viewers different from those generations that watched, say, "I Love Lucy," was that many of these kids were the products of broken homes. Divorces skyrocketed in the '70s and '80s, causing immense pain and dislocation. Yet, every afternoon, kids could watch this program where a blended family had worked things out.

—THE LURE OF NOSTALGIA. With their overromanticizing of the '50s

and '60s, baby boomers sometimes make it seem as if their Wonder Years were the only ones that mattered. As the post-boomers entered their 20s and 30s, they began to mythologize their own pasts — a key part of which was spent watching "The Brady Bunch." And after dealing with the second-hand nostalgia (classic handed down by the boomers, "The Brady Bunch" was something they could call their own, a kind of video fraternal handshake. The oldest boomers weren't hooked on "The Brady Bunch"; when it pre-

miered in 1969 they were in their early 20s, and most, certainly, didn't stay home Friday nights to watch TV.

—THE KITSCH VALUES. The 1970s was, as everyone agrees, among the most taste-free decades in world history. And in every episode of "The Brady Bunch," the most garish excesses of that decade are in your face: from the Bradys' avocado- and tangerine-colored kitchen to their "groovy" hairstyles to the crocheted vests, Hucklepoo shirts and plaid bell-bottoms. It's humorous and embarrassing to realize that many of us wore the same

outlandish outfits, and even more amusing to those who were too young to be there the first time around.

From an adult perspective, some of the show's more goofy contrivances stand out in even bolder relief. Not just how dorky the kids were, but how did nine people share one bathroom (and one wherever never saw or heard a toilet)? What about the sexual subtext between Greg and Marcia? How the hell did the family live that lifestyle on one income?

And, they really acted like a bunch of white-bread dorks, didn't they?
