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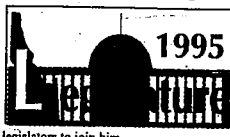
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Farm worker insurance moves ahead

Batt endorses bill, encourages lawmakers to approve measure

BOISE — Backers of workers' compensation for farm workers triumphed twice Thursday afternoon.
First, the House Human Resources Committee voted 7-5 to endorse HB 195 — which would end Idaho's 78-year-old workers' compensation exemption for agriculture.
Then, Republican Gov. Phil Batt vigorously endorsed HB 195 — and called on



legislators to join him.
"Farm workers deserve the same treatment and protection as any other citizen in Idaho," Batt told *The Times-News*.

Asked if he thinks the House of Representatives should back HB 195 — despite opposition from a number of farm organizations — Batt said "Yes, I do. It was in my package of recommendations and I urge them to pass it."
This isn't the first time Batt has supported extending workers' compensation to farm laborers. In his State of the State address, Batt urged the Legislature, farm employers and farm workers "to sit down together, make whatever concessions are necessary and put this matter behind us."

But a host of agriculture organizations refused to back HB 195, even though it contained a number of concessions to agriculture. And the Idaho Farm Bureau Federation has insisted that any workers' compensation coverage for agriculture be on a voluntary basis.
Batt has decided to back HB 195 — with or without encouragement from farm lobbyists. The governor's support for the bill could sway some legislators, state Rep. Mark Stubbs, R-Twin Falls, predicted.

Deputies clean neglected farm

Dozens of animals found without food, water

KIMBERLY — A Kimberly farmer is under investigation after dozens of hogs, rabbits and other animals were left alone without nourishment on his farm, sheriff's deputies said Thursday.
Six hogs belonging to Emmett Pond, 50, were discovered dead in an outdoor pen by 24 other hogs in an outdoor pigpen, said Sgt. T.L. Peterson of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department.
Food and water bowls were empty when deputies arrived at the farm six miles south of Kimberly Wednesday night, Peterson said. Neighbors who called the sheriff reported that Pond had been gone for several days, he said.
At least a dozen rabbits were dead.

'All Creatures' author, veterinarian Herriott dies

LONDON — James Herriot, who shared his experiences as a country veterinarian in the best-selling memoir "All Creatures Great and Small," died Thursday in the Yorkshire Dales where he had ministered to animals for more than half a century. He was 78.
Herriot died of prostate cancer at his home near Thirsk, his granddaughter, Emma Page, said.
"He had been ill for three years but he had borne his illness very patiently and bravely. His family were all with him when he died peacefully at home today," she said.
Despite the pen name and Thirsk's name, he could.

Herriot — the pen name and alter ego of James Alfred Wight — wrote 15 books in the time that he could wrest away from his practice. They sold some 50 million copies in 20 countries.
But he continued his veterinary practice long after his books made him famous.
"If a farmer calls me with a sick animal, he couldn't care less if I were George Bernard Shaw," he once said.
A quiet, modest man with a trace of his Glasgow upbringing in his voice, "All" Wight kept out of the limelight as best he could.

Dow bolsters optimism

NEW YORK — The Dow his 4,000.
So what, you say?
Is it going to get you a raise tomorrow, find you a better job or cut your mortgage rate?
Probably not.
While average Americans who never owned a share in their lives might be tempted to yawn at Thursday's market milestone, economists say the optimism that brought it about could benefit everyone in the long run.
The Dow Jones industrial average — the best known barometer of the stock market — overcame months of uncertainty over the economy and inflation to top 4,000 for the first time.
The average, compiled from the stocks of 30 of

Today's weather fact

As part of hourly weather observations, the base, or ceiling, of clouds, is always reported.
 If you want to know the height of those clouds but don't have access to that information, here's an easy way to figure it out.
 Find out the current dew point and actual air temperature. Subtract the dew point from the temperature. Take the answer and add 200 feet for every degree. For example, if the dew point is 60 degrees and the temperature is 80 degrees, then 80 minus 60 equals 20 degrees. Multiply 200 feet by 20 degrees and you have 4,000 feet. Now you know the cloud base is 4,000 feet above your head.

 "If the governor endorses it, I predict it will pass," Stubbs said. Butt's support "gives the middle-of-the-road average conservative Republican an excuse to vote 'yes' if he or she is looking for an excuse," he said.
 It also emboldens lawmakers to vote their conscience on the issue, according to Stubbs.
 For a few moments Thursday, it looked like HB 195 might die quietly in committee. The bill's chief proponent, state Rep. Jesse Berain, R-Boise, needed seven votes to move the bill out of committee — and his personal nose count showed just "yes" votes.
 But the last undecided committee member, state Rep. Dave Baumann, R-Boise, a first-term member who sat silently through most of the debate, backed the bill — giving Berain and state Rep. William Bell, R-Nampa, a narrow victory.
 Opponents of HB 195 call it an "unfunded mandate" on agriculture and warn it would imperil some

Idaho farms. Supporters say the current exemption is unfair to other Gem State businesses, unfair to farm workers, and unfair to taxpayers — who pay the bills when independent farm workers need major medical care.
 House Bill 195 includes some protections for small family farms, but lawmakers are divided over whether those provisions are sufficient. HB 195 would exempt from mandatory coverage:
 • Workers at farms that employ no more than two full-timers.
 • Farmers' family members.
 • Shareholders who own 10 percent or more of an Idaho farm.
 Both sides predict a fiery debate on HB 195, when the entire House or Representatives takes up the issue. And with the powerful Farm Bureau — the state's top farm insurance seller — fighting the measure, it could be a close vote.
 State Rep. Maxine Bell, R-Jerome, a Farm Bureau ally, said she's voting against HB 195 — even if it has the governor's backing.

Bell said she's talked to Magic Valley farmers who will suffer if the agriculture exemption is lifted. "I know the impact it'll have on my neighbors in Jerome and the fellow down the road in Rupert," Bell said — predicting HB 195 will make it tougher for Idaho farmers to survive.
 When the state places another unfunded mandate on agriculture, farmers can't pass the cost on to the consumer, Bell added.
 Stubbs plans on voting "yes" and he's looking forward to the fireworks. "It's probably going to be the best debate this session," he said.
 The Twin Falls attorney said, "the time has come" to treat farm workers — a group that is predominantly Hispanic — like all other labor groups in Idaho.
 "Farm laborers should have filed a suit a long time ago because I think (the exemption) is unconstitutional," Stubbs said. "I think they've been denied equal protection long enough."

Hinckley will Vet

WASHINGTON (AP) — John Hinckley has agreed to pay as much as \$2.9 million in possible book royalties to the publisher of a book about his life story, according to his 1981 assassination attempt against President Reagan, lawyers in the case said Thursday.
 The agreement, which Hinckley's attorneys said he signed Monday at the mental hospital where he is confined, provides for his co-operation in the sale of his life story. It could lead to a movie or book revealing his reflections on the attack, which he has said was a way of drawing attention to his love for actress Jodie Foster.
 But Hinckley would receive no more than \$3,000 a year, or \$12,000 if he ever were released from the hospital, said Brady's lawyer, Frederic W. Schwartz Jr.

 Of those still alive, some appeared sickly, with eye and ear infections, and fur loss. They were kept in wire cages in Pond's barn, Peterson said.
 "Some were so diseased they will have to be destroyed," said Deputy Darin Brown. "Others will take two or three weeks to recover."
 Thursday, rabbit breeders and a farmer hauled away most of the live animals, including about six ducks, a dozen chickens, two geese and four pot-bellied pigs.
 Local veterinarian John Lowry said the fowl seemed healthy, and police said the pot-bellied pigs also appeared to be OK.
 Pond told police he had been trying to get rid of the animals for several months because the owner of the farm is selling the land that he leases, Peterson said.
 "He was super cooperative," Peterson said. "He seemed almost relieved that we were here."

 don't think it spells anything."
 Ken Robinson, account manager for a Phoenix freight company said, "I've always felt that even though the economy has been bad, the Dow Jones has still climbed. I don't think it is an indication."
 Economists said while there's no magic in the number 4,000, the reasons behind the market's current rally are important.
 Markets are rising because investors are confident that economic growth is continuing with low inflation. Interest rates are stabilizing, and a recession is unlikely.
 These rising markets can make even small investors and non-investors feel there's greater wealth ahead, economists say.
 "It might make you go out and purchase an automobile or new fur-

niture," said Randall Moore, executive editor of Blue Chip Economic Indicators, a newsletter published in Alexandria, Va.
 Higher consumer spending ripples through the rest of the economy, helping keep jobs, wages and corporate profits rising.
 Thursday's milestone was triggered by comments Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan made Wednesday that the central bank may be finished raising interest rates.
 The interest rate increases, which raise borrowing costs and can reduce corporate profits, were designed to slow the economy just enough to prevent inflation. But they also stalled the stock market.
 On Wednesday, with signs that economic growth is slowing,

Greenspan suggested in Senate testimony that the central bank will soon stop raising rates and may even begin reducing them.
 "So the perception is that the risk of a big upsurge in interest rates has dropped and risk of a resulting recession has dropped," said Richard B. Hoey, chief economist at the Dreyfus Corp., a big mutual fund company in New York.
 This perception has been taking root for several months, helping stocks and bonds. As bond prices rise, their yields drop, and this has a big effect on the rates banks charge consumers.
 When those making financial decisions believe interest rates are stable, that's a good for everyone, said Sandra Shaber, consumer economist with Wala Group, a consulting company in Bala Cynwyd, Pa.

Group issues grades for health plans

WASHINGTON (AP) — Trying to help consumers shop for the best medical coverage, an accrediting group released a model report card Thursday grading 21 health plans on how well they take care of their customers.

The plans that volunteered to be graded in the pilot project cover almost 10 million Americans and include health maintenance organizations in more than a dozen states.

They are sponsored by some of the biggest names in the health business, including Kaiser Permanente, MetLife, Prudential, U.S. Healthcare and several Blue Cross plans.

They were judged on three dozen measures of quality, patient satisfaction and performance, including how many people quit each year, how long they wound up in the hospital, how many children got all their shots and whether they checked adults' cholesterol.

The National Committee for Quality Assurance, a nonprofit group that accredits HMOs, said the results demonstrate that it is possible to give the public meaningful comparisons of

different health plans.

Many health plans have produced their own report cards, but this \$2.1 million project was the first to provide independently audited results across so many plans.

The committee released a 296-page report detailing how well the plans did as a group, along with individual profiles of each plan. It was based on a review of medical records and other charts, as well as a survey of 10,000 patients.

The grades varied widely for the plans, which volunteered for the experiment and kicked in most of the money.

"We believe this information ... will drive the whole health care system towards improvement," said Margaret E. O'Kane, president of the accreditation agency.

"The way we're going to get better in this industry is by finding out who's doing it best," said Helen Darling, manager of health care strategy and programs for Xerox Corp., which has pressed health plans to release their performance records.

The study found some wide variations:

- The percentage of members who quit ranged from 2 percent at the Blue Cross HMO in Rochester, N.Y., to 48 percent at MetLife of St. Louis.
- While 79 percent of children had all their shots, this ranged from a low of 60 percent at Southwest, an Acta HMO in Dallas, to a high of 91 percent at the Harvard Community Health Plan in Massachusetts.
- At Private Healthcare Systems' point of service plan in northern California, only 43 percent of women ages 32-64 got mammograms to screen for breast cancer. At the Prudential HMO in Orlando, Fla., 83 percent of the women got mammograms. The average was 71 percent.
- The president of Private Healthcare Systems, Gene P. Gusculli, said the study's scorecard was geared more toward traditional HMOs than other forms of managed care.
- The health plans' members ages 45-65 spent on average 425 days in the hospital annually per 1,000 members. But those in HIP of Greater New York spent only 151 days in the hospital, while the Prudential plan in Orlando logged 814 days.
- Nearly nine out of 10 patients were screened for high cholesterol at Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts' Bay State plan, while Private Healthcare Systems in California checked just one in three; the average was two out of three.

Official says reactor won't hurt Korea pact

WASHINGTON (AP) — North Korean refusal to accept a nuclear reactor from South Korea won't nullify the agreement requiring the communist regime to freeze its nuclear program, a State Department official said Thursday.

Robert Gallucci, an ambassador at large, told the House International Relations Committee that the Pyongyang regime was balking at accepting the reactor because "we believe the North finds it politically difficult to have South Korean build reactors in its country."

"Is it fair to say, if North Korea rejects the use of South Korean reactors, then we do not have an agreement?" asked Rep. Toby Roth, R-Wis.

Judiciary Committee OKs 'loser pays' bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — It would be tougher for consumers to win punitive damages from companies for harmful products under a bill passed Thursday by the House Judiciary Committee.

The panel, by a 21-11 vote mostly along party lines, approved the bill and sent it to the full House. One Democrat, Rep. Frederick Boucher of Virginia, supported the measure.

The committee also passed, by a 19-12 party-line vote, a companion

bill that would, among other things, require the losers of many federal lawsuits to pay the winners' legal fees. Rep. Zoe Lofgren, D-Calif., voted with the Republicans for the measure.

Supporters of the so-called loser pays system say it would discourage frivolous lawsuits and promote settlement of worthy ones. But opponents, including House Democrats, contend it would hurt ordinary citizens who couldn't afford to pay big attorneys' fees.

The bill "will make it more difficult for the poorest members of our society to receive justice," said Rep. John Conyers of Michigan, the committee's senior Democrat.

Both measures are part of the GOP's "Contract With America." Of all the items in that legislative agenda, the punitive damages bill is the one House Speaker Newt Gingrich says he worries most about losing. Last week, Gingrich predicted that it would be the toughest fight of the

next 60 days and that the nation's trial lawyers, who oppose it, would create "a real brawl."

The punitive damages bill would establish a national, uniform set of laws on product liability and limit the sums awarded to injured people.

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Pentagon: U.S. bases overseas to be cut back

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a reminder that military base closings and consolidations extend beyond U.S. shores, the Pentagon announced Thursday it intends to close or reduce operations at eight overseas support installations.

The announcement was a prelude to next Tuesday's scheduled presentation of a list of U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps bases that the Pentagon wants to close or realign to fit today's smaller armed forces.

The overseas installations targeted for closure or curtailment include four in Germany, which was the nerve center of U.S. and allied defenses during the Cold War. U.S. forces have pulled out of hundreds of sites in Germany since 1990.

The Pentagon said it intends to shut down Wiesbaden Hospital in Lindsey, Germany, and — as with other installations overseas that house U.S. forces — return the site to the host government. The United States does not own any of the land on which it operates overseas.

An ammunition site and housing areas elsewhere in Germany also will be closed down or curtailed.

The Pentagon said it also would curtail activities of a facility in Sigonella, Italy, that is used by the U.S. Navy, and it will abandon a naval support facility in Antigua that is used by the U.S. Atlantic Command.

Since January 1990, the Pentagon has announced closures of 866 military facilities overseas — mostly in Germany, South Korea and Britain — and said it was curtailing operations at 84 others.

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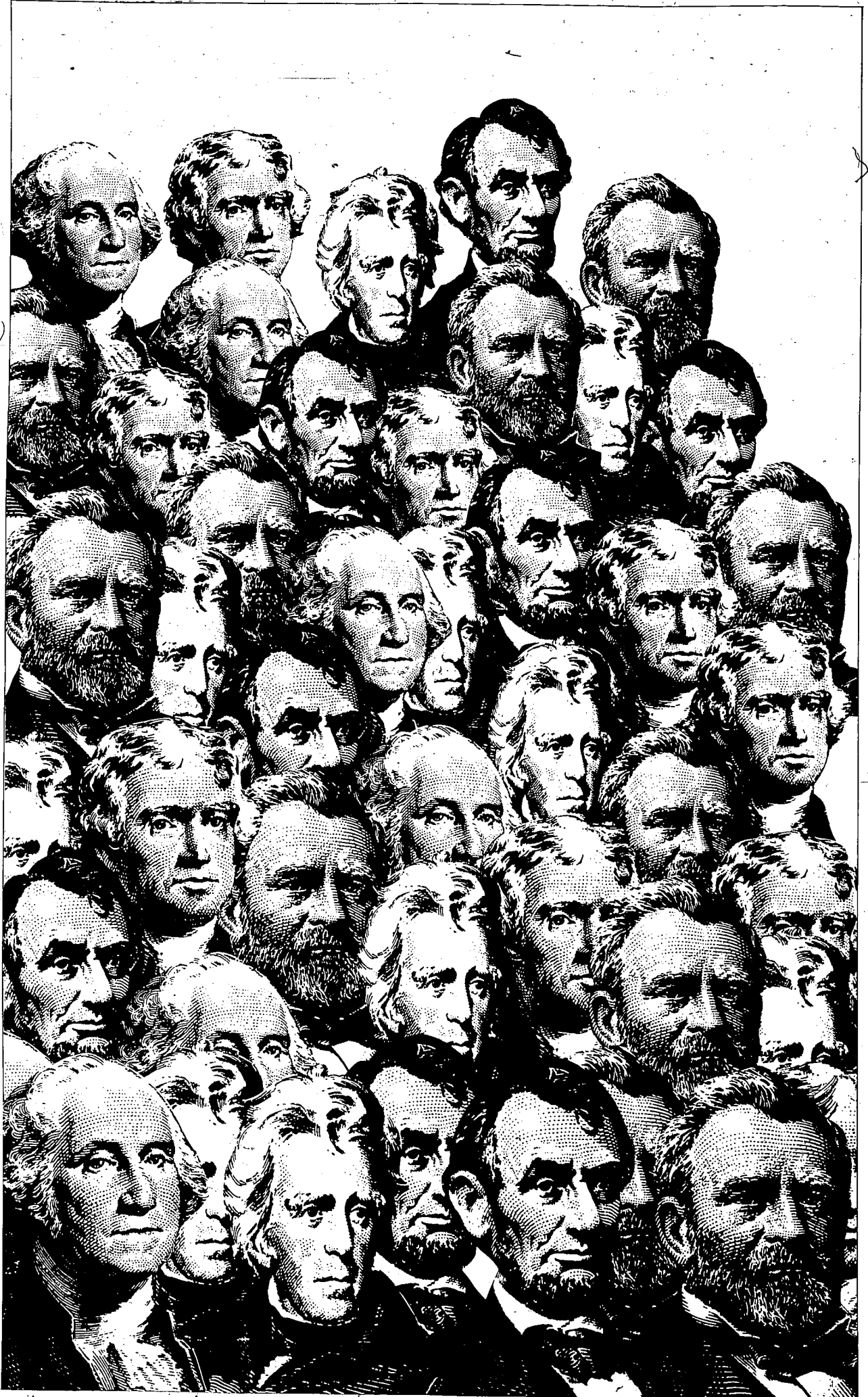
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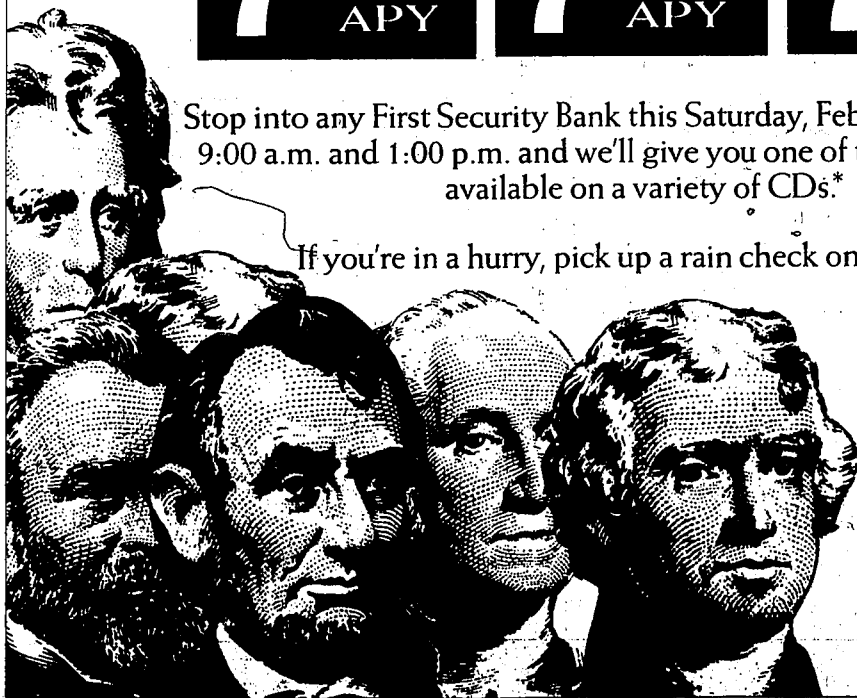

Rethinking of affirmative action laws is overdue

Newt Gingrich, who is not running for president yet, and who therefore is allowed to say what he thinks, said this week what lots of American politicians have been afraid to say in the past 20 years:

"It is antithetical to the American dream to measure people by the genes of their great-grandmothers."

The fiery House speaker made that remark after his colleagues had rejected a tax break for minority owners of broadcast stations. The vote appalled some Democrats, who predicted it would be the start of a broad Republican assault on affirmative action preferences.

Let us all hope the Democrats' dire warning proves correct.

Affirmative action is a category of policies and programs dedicated to the proposition that two wrongs make a right. Its supporters teach us that women and minority-group members — especially blacks — need and deserve preferential treatment in order to overcome generations of discrimination.

This concept somehow sidesteps the constitutional guarantee of equal protection under the law. And its supporters somehow keep their faces straight while denying that affirmative action leads to quota-based hiring.

Lots of people, though philosophically dubious about affirmative action, have accepted it on practical grounds. Demonstrably, minorities

and women have long been discriminated against. Demonstrably, they have been underrepresented in many well-paid occupations, in management and in business ownership. So why not give them a boost?

That reasoning contains several flaws. By implying that women and non-whites cannot succeed on a level field, it promotes the myth of racial and gender inferiority. By basing economic decisions (such as hiring and awarding government contracts) on factors other than merit, it promotes mediocrity. And, by causing whites to feel discriminated against, it promotes interracial tension.

Resentment against affirmative action clearly helped fuel the GOP election sweep that put Gingrich in power.

This week, Gingrich outlined his "vision and strategies" for the remaining days of the 104th Congress. Among his plans is an attack on racially based affirmative action laws. Affirmative action, Gingrich said, should be replaced by a system that benefits the needy, regardless of gender or ethnic background.

In recent years, anyone who voiced that viewpoint could count on being labeled a bigot, and Gingrich's probably will be. But he speaks not only for a vast constituency of Americans, but also for the cherished concept of equal opportunity, in which no one is more equal than anyone else.



Powell, GOP's best shot, is no-show in N.H.

Where is Colin Powell now that they need him?

That was the unspoken riddle as nine 1996 Republican wannabes jostled before TV cameras in a Manchester, N.H., mob scene.

True, nobody knows whether ex-General Powell wants to run for president. Or whether he's Republican or Democrat. Or whether his enormous popularity would instantly fade when exposed to political heat.

But Powell's four-star charisma could add badly needed glamour and authority to this ho-hum field.

"Unless Colin Powell rides in on a stallion, the next president will be someone in this room — a pride of eight lions and a lioness," said Rep. Bob Dornan, R-Calif.

But the lions didn't seem ready for the Big Top.

Even the 1,400 Republican faithful seemed underwhelmed by the tryout session. These New Hampshire folk are hard-eyed talent scouts. As the first primary state, they size up candidates in kitchens and barber shops. They've picked the GOP nominee (Nixon, Ford, Reagan/Bush) for the last six elections.

I didn't detect the early '96 field lighting any fires. Some yearn for Powell, who runs second in polls without lifting a finger. Others hanker for Newt Gingrich, the never-silent House Speaker too busy to trifle with White House politics.

Instead, there's a canini: "Is That All There Is?" After all, the '96 Republican crowd includes a retired (Bob Dole, three-time national loser), U.S. Senate glory-seekers (Phil Gramm, Richard Lugar, Arlen Specter), a self-advertised outsider (Lamar Alexander), a Labor secretary (Lynn Martin) and bombastic cranks (Pat Buchanan, Alan Keyes and Bob Dornan).

If this were spring training, the Republican nine looked like replacement players — aging veterans and one-shot unknowns.

They look good in their uniforms. But no one pretends they're Ronald Reagan, Carter or Griffler. Or the next Ronald Reagan, a deity whose name they invoked constantly in dreamy nostalgia.

Deservedly, Bob Dole is the early book front-runner. The stinging bitterness of his '88 defeat by Bush has mellowed. Age — at 73, he'd be the oldest rookie president — could be Dole's handicap.

Phil Gramm? The Texas conservative, who launched a four-state marathon this week, has big bucks and a fierce lust for the job. But Gramm's fiscal monotone caused N.H. yawns.

Lamar Alexander? The personable Tennessean needs more substance than his mantra, "I am not a Washington insider." (Pardon, Lamar, but weren't you in the Bush Cabinet?)

Of longshots, Specter has a raison d'être in his crusade against the Christian Right and anti-abortion wing.

What the Republican nine has going for it is Bill Clinton's vulnerability. Oddly, they're cocksure they can whip Clinton but barely mention his name. "Why aren't we going after Clinton?" boomed Dornan.

"We've got to do better."

One reason: Economic good times. New Hampshire, in noisy rebellion against Bush in 1992, is smoothly prosperous. Unemployment's been shaved in half. A Boston Globe poll showed people by 2-1 were "better off than four years ago."

If they're discreet in jabbing Clinton on the economy for now, that doesn't mean Republicans will give the president a free ride on his character. They think they'll overlook

Whitewater, Paula Jones or his non-military service?

Not if Dornan, leather-lunged California showboat, has access to a microphone. "He's an illegitimate president... a serial adulterer... a triple draft dodger," bellowed Dornan.

A peacetime Air Force pilot who went to Vietnam as a TV talk-show host, Dornan scratches Clinton as the '96 opponent: Sen. Bob Kerrey, D-Meb., "a Medal of Honor winner, will win the Democratic primaries. That gives ex-military guys an edge — like Dole and me."

Dole is more subtly nuanced in contrasting his military background — he was badly injured in Italy in World War II — with Clinton's dithering over Vietnam. He intones that he decided to run for president while attending 50th D-Day ceremonies in Normandy.

"I began thinking maybe, just maybe, my generation has one more mission, one more call to duty," says Dole.

Sounds sententious, but true.

I encountered Dole at the D-Day rituals at Omaha Beach. Clinton had just orated movingly at the American cemetery. Dole was everywhere, shaking hands (his right arm still suffers from his wounds) with veterans and their families.

Even on that somber day, he had the look of a guy running hard for president.

Never mind that he's stumbled in past campaigns, and he's 71 now, that his future depends on Gingrich's success, that U.S. senators rarely succeed in national show-downs.

If a mature war hero is the Republicans' best shot against Clinton, Dole's the one.

Unless an ex-general whom some call the "black Ike" waxes out all 1996 bets. Colin, will you please answer the phone?

Migraines a biochemical illness

As a 34-year migraineur, I was interested in the new findings about headaches which you reported on Feb. 16.

Perhaps the findings of Dr. Robinson, et al., are accurate and offer great hope to persons afflicted with tension headaches. However, I believe the last sentence contained less than accurate information concerning migraines, an altogether different disorder. It quotes Dr. Keith Campbell of the Mayo Clinic as saying that most researchers agree that migraines are caused by contracting blood vessels in the head (emphasis mine). Could this be an outdated quote?

According to "Migraine: The Complete Guide" by the American Council on Headache Education with Constantine and Scott published in May 1994, "This theory sounds so plausible, so painfully like your experience, that you may be surprised to learn that scientists no longer believe it. True, changes in blood circulation do accompany migraine. But it has now become clear that these changes are the results of the migraine, not the cause. Today the consensus is that migraine is a biochemical disorder within the brain, not a blood-vessel

(vascular) disorder" (emphasis mine).

Indeed, the reaction to the vasoconstrictive Imirex (sumatriptan) is often so effective in alleviating migraine is that it mimics the action of the brain chemical, serotonin.

Dr. Campbell is a respected and knowledgeable neurologist. The American Council for Headache Education enjoys the same reputation. Their reportedly opposing views on the cause of migraines negate the foundation which migraineurs experience when attempting to communicate their illness and its causes to others. This letter is my endeavor to help readers understand that migraine is a physical, biochemical illness.

Plan limits rights of all to help few

Our state Legislature is considering a misguided constitutional amendment (House Joint Resolution 9, formerly HJR 7) aimed at banning statewide initiatives and local ordinances from regulating use of natural resources on federal and state-controlled lands and waters.

While it is no secret that most of our Idaho legislators represent the special interests of the livestock, mining and timber industries while ignoring the wishes of the rest of us (the majority they are supposed to represent) who are interested in preserving the quality of life that the diverse natural environment of Idaho offers. Because this amendment casts a broad net, it would preclude citizen initiatives on virtually any natural resource issue affecting the people of Idaho.

This amendment began as an undemocratic attempt to appease a small group of black bear baiters and cougar houndsmen but, as written, would subvert the constitutional rights of all Idahoans to petition their government on natural resource issues.

I find it particularly ironic that we caution visitors to public lands to keep food out of the reach of bears, and yet we permit a few

"hunters" (often out-of-state hunters) to engage in the reverse of this advice. Cougars are hunted and treed where they can be shot out of the tree by a band of dogs who seem to have no other function.

Normally cougars will use all of their secretive and well-adapted skills to avoid humans. Yet we wonder why we are having more cougar and black bear encounters.

Most often when these encounters occur, the animals pay with their lives. I probably don't need to add that these animals are not hunted for food but will instead become a rug or trophy on someone's wall.

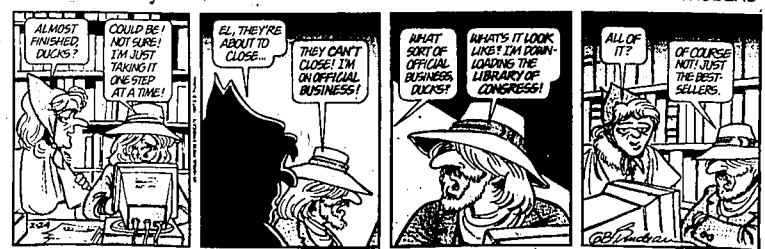
Bear baiting was rejected by the people of Colorado in 1992 and Oregon in 1994, and public polls in Idaho have determined that the majority of Idahoans favor abolishing bear baiting. Yet the vocal minority is calling the shots.

HJR 9 would sacrifice the rights of all Idahoans to an open initiative process to appease a small group of economic interests. The initiative process is a sacred and special constitutional right that underlies our most democratic principles of a government by and for the people.

Clinton defends U.S. role abroad

OTTAWA (AP) — Loudly cheered by Canada's parliament, President Clinton pledged Thursday to resist Republican-led efforts at home to cut back on international peacekeeping duties and other U.S. foreign commitments.

"For a half-century," Clinton told Canadian lawmakers, "the United States has shared your philosophy of action and consistent exercise of leadership abroad. And I am determined, notwithstanding all the crosscurrents in our country, that we shall preserve that commitment."

The prime minister said he was "absolutely" satisfied with the way Clinton handled the Quebec question. "I think they got the message," Clinton said.

Ottawa was blanketed with snow but skies were sunny and the weather was almost spring-like as Clinton arrived for an overnight stay, his first state visit to Canada. Skiers raced along the frozen Rideau Canal as his motorcade rode by, and some cross-country skiers waved to the president in the countryside on his ride in from the airport.

Clinton's trip was a celebration of extraordinarily warm relations between the United States and Canada, whose \$250 billion trade relationship is the largest in the world.

"There probably has not been a time in our relations with Canada in the last decade or more in which there was less problems in our bilateral relationships," Anthony Lake, Clinton's national security adviser, said.

Following a tradition of visiting foreign leaders, Clinton helped plant a sugar maple tree in the front yard of Rideau Hall, the official residence of Canadian Governor General Romeo LeBlanc. Six other Americans have planted trees on the 88-acre grounds; John F. Kennedy seriously aggravated an old back injury in 1961 when he threw a dozen shovelfuls of dirt to plant two red oaks.

Spy case sets off backlash

PARIS (AP) — The disclosure of spying allegations against U.S. diplomats backfired Thursday on Premier Edouard Balladur.

His foreign minister said he was "scandalized" by the leak, and political rivals claimed he was trying to divert attention from his troubled presidential campaign.

"It's a campaign maneuver," said Philippe Vasseur, a backer of rival conservative candidate Jacques Chirac. "They were trying to create a smoke screen."

Many critics said the disclosure needlessly damaged French-American relations at a time when the two allies already have many economic and diplomatic differences.

Critics also noted the story was leaked to a newspaper as Balladur's lead in the presidential race evaporated amid a wiretapping scandal and other woes.

Le Monde newspaper reported Wednesday that five Americans — including four diplomats — have been asked to leave France for allegedly conducting political, military and economic espionage for the CIA. Among them, French officials say, is the CIA station chief.

France's foreign and interior ministries confirmed the report in a joint statement, but said the information was not intended to be made public.

U.S. officials called the charges unwarranted and expressed amazement that they were made public. State Department spokeswoman Christine Shelly said Thursday that it was unlikely the diplomats would leave before their postings ended.

There was strikingly little anti-American rhetoric in France in the aftermath of the disclosures and no noisy calls for the government to ensure the rapid exit of the alleged spies.

Even the likelihood that the five suspects would remain in France roused minimal indignation in a country that has grown accustomed to reports of spying between the two countries.

Foreign Minister Alain Juppe agreed with Washington that the allegations should have been handled quietly. He said he was "scandalized" that authoritative details of the case had been leaked to Le Monde.

Juppe called for an investigation into the leak. Balladur's campaign spokesman, Budget Minister Nicolas Sarkozy, said the investigation had begun Wednesday.

Report reveals Soviet Union launched almost 3,000 space missions

MOSCOW (AP) — Disclosing once-secret missions for the first time, a new report prepared for parliament Thursday says Russia and the Soviet Union have put nearly 3,000 satellites or spacecraft into orbit.

Meanwhile, Russia's top space official warned that lack of funding could cripple Russia's space program within months, the ITAR-Tass news agency said.

The secret launches were made public during parliamentary hearings on space exploration. More than 5 percent of the launches, including tests, were aborted and 2 percent of satellites veered into miscalculated orbits, ITAR-Tass said without elaborating.

The data covers all flights since the Soviet Union launched the space era by sending Sputnik into orbit in 1957. A total of 2,656 booster rockets have launched 2,976 satellites into orbit since then.

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Former President Carter returns to Haiti to help build democracy

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Former President Carter, who played a key role in ending military rule in Haiti last fall, returned Thursday on a visit aimed at bolstering the country's fragile democracy.

Carter said he planned to "explore ways in which we might be helpful in reinforcing a free and fair electoral process." Also on the agenda during his three-day visit is a review of the international aid effort in Haiti.

The next major democratic test for Haiti is scheduled for June 4, when the first round of legislative and local elections takes place. Presidential elections are set for December.

Carter landed in Port-au-Prince in the afternoon. He will be joined today by Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., and retired Gen. Colin Powell, former chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. All three were instrumental in the departure of Haiti's military leadership.

Panel OKs switch in drug-fund use

BOISE - State Rep. Celia Gould's proposal to take half of the state's drug abuse prevention fund to pay for county juvenile justice programs was endorsed - barely - Thursday.

But opponents warned that Gould's bill will lead to a "bloody battle" on the floor of the House of Representatives next week between supporters and opponents of cigarette tax-funded substance abuse prevention programs.

Gould, R-Buhl, co-chair of the

Legislature's interim committee on juvenile justice, won Thursday's battle in the House Revenue and Taxation Committee. But her proposal angered some of her Republican colleagues, and it was bitterly opposed by two Magic Valley legislators: Reps. Jim Kempton, R-Albion, and Mark Stubbs, R-Twin Falls.

"I think we ought to floor fight this one," Kempton told Stubbs after losing the vote. Stubbs agreed, vowing to amend the proposal on the House floor. Stubbs also said he may seek a separate 5-cents-a-pack tax on cigarettes to pay for the juvenile justice program.

Twin Falls School Superintendent Terrell

Donicht, on hand for the vote, didn't like the outcome either.

"I think it would have been a better idea had they looked at another source of funds - other than substance abuse," Donicht said.

A 10-cents-per-pack tax on cigarettes generates \$7 million for school-based prevention programs. Overall, that amounts to about \$35 per Gem State student. By comparison, Washington State spends \$250 per student on its anti-drug, alcohol and tobacco programs.

Critics of House Bill 183 - Gould's legislation - say Idaho schools can't get the job done on just \$17.50 per student. Some, like Donicht, warn that prevention and juvenile

probation programs may suffer with HB 183.

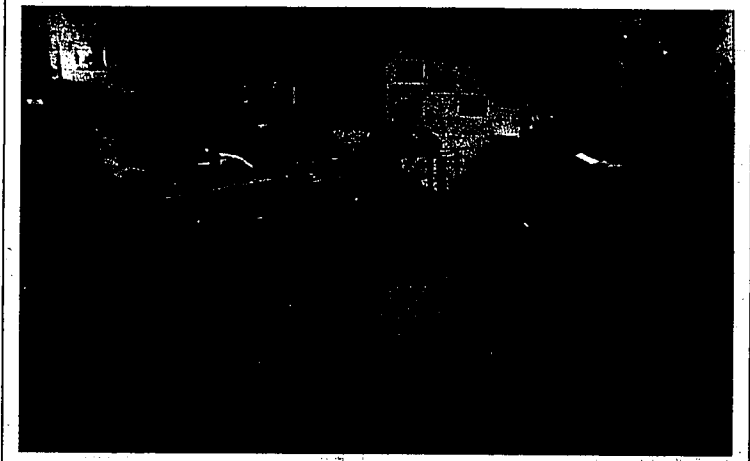
"They need to fully fund both programs if they expect them both to succeed, so I'd have to say the outcome was disappointing," Donicht said.

Gould argued that it makes sense to use the drug and alcohol prevention funds to pay for juvenile justice programs because many juvenile offenders have substance abuse problems. She was backed by county officials who said they need state money to make the system work.

State Rep. Frank Brunel, R-Lewiston, said Idaho is engaged in "deadly combat" as

Program brings movers and shakers into city schools

TWIN FALLS - Dr. Harry Brumbach warned the seventh-graders that they scared the Sam Hill out of him, and that he'd rather be in surgery.

"I think that I'm more nervous about this than anything I've ever done except take finals," he told them.

Then he balanced the book against his stomach and began to read.

Once there was a tree and she loved a little boy.

The Vera C. O'Leary Junior High School class quieted as Brumbach read Shel Silverstein's "The Giving Tree," a story about a tree who gave

everything to a boy - her apples to sell for money, her branches to build a house, her trunk for a boat - because she loved him so much.

At the end, Brumbach shut the book and looked at the kids.

"Every book is a tree and I wish every one of you would suck every book for all its knowledge," he said.

The class terrified him, he said, because his message was so important. He hoped he could convey it to the students.

Brumbach was one of more than a dozen local success stories invited by the O'Leary Parents, Teachers and Students Organization to read for 15 minutes to a class. It's part of the school's effort to encourage students

to start reading. Read to Succeed Week will conclude today, with students bringing pillows and curling up with their favorite books in class.

Judges, media personalities, doctors and teachers brought books of their choosing Thursday: Martin Luther King's speeches, outdoor humor, science fiction, old letters.

"Because these people are lovers of reading, I hope that they'd entice a few kids to pick up some books," said PTSSO President Debby Miciak. "I think a lot of kids don't value reading for reading's sake."

Brumbach confided to the students that unlike other avid readers, he had hated reading when he was growing

Hailey eyes banning snowmobiles from streets

HAILEY - A proposed ordinance would make it illegal for snowmobiles to be driven on city streets to reach side canyons and hill-sides.

The Hailey City Council recently voted to repeal a 1970 ordinance that had authorized snowmobiles, under certain conditions, to use city streets.

"It's just too dangerous, someone's gonna get killed," said Hailey Police Chief Jack Stoneback.

A lot has changed in Hailey since 1970. At that time, Hailey's population was about 1,000, and no subdivisions surrounded the

section of town, Stoneback said.

Following Blaine County's population boom, Hailey has quadrupled to more than 5,500 residents.

"Back in '70 when there were only 1,000 people here, it wasn't such a big deal," Stoneback said. "Now it's just not safe to have snowmachines running up and down the streets."

Complaints of noise, of snowmobiles running through people's yards and of speeding and concerns of public safety prompted Stoneback to seek repeal.

To Stoneback's memory, no snowmobile accidents have been reported since the law was passed.

Despite protests from the Sawtooth

Snowmachine Club, the Hailey City Council wants to restrict access to the side canyons and keep snowmobiles off city streets.

City Clerk Heather Dawson said the city will keep the parking lot at the Lion's Park on the west side of Hailey paved so residents can park their trucks and trailers there to off-load their machines.

In addition, councilman Brad Siemer will co-ordinate plowing efforts with the county's road crew to see if a parking area on Quigly Canyon Road can be maintained for access to the east.

The second reading of the ordinance is set for Feb. 27, followed in March with the third reading after which the law will take effect.

County considers turning wayside into park area

FILER - City and county officials hope they can buy from the state the old U.S. 30 highway rest area near Cedar Draw to preserve the open space from developers.

"I'd really hate to lose it to modular homes or something else," said County Commissioner Brent Reinke.

The commissioners voted Thursday to spend \$500 toward administrative and appraisal costs to speed up the sale. Bob Slater, the Transportation Department's regional right-of-way supervisor in Shoshone, said the county needs to pay such a fee to confirm its interest in the land.

"Once they do that, we will declare the property surplus and have it appraised," Slater said.

Filer Mayor Russell "Bud" Sheridan said the city already has been maintaining the 10-acre rest area for several years.

"The state has just basically let it go," Sheridan said.

The state owns 20 acres along the south side of Highway 30 just west of Filer. About half of that developed as the Cedar Draw rest area and includes trees, picnic tables, a well and a paved road loop. But the area has not changed much since it was built in 1970.

"The rest area was never improved to the point of drinking water or toilets," Slater said.

Portable toilets were there only a short time because of problems with waste and vandals, he said. Because the area sits close to Cedar Draw, approval of permanent rest rooms or other facilities would be hard to get from state environmental officials, he said.

The Transportation Department also considers the rest area a low priority because mountains have other opportunities to build a highway rest area.

2 juveniles charged after Moscow standoff

MOSCOW (AP) — Two juveniles have been charged with weapons violations following a standoff with Moscow police and Latah County sheriffs deputies. One juvenile is charged with possession of a stolen firearm, the other with theft of two handguns, said Moscow police Lt. Don Lanpher Jr. Tim Barbier, 18, of Moscow, told police he was held in an apartment against his will by six men, who brandished a shotgun and four handguns. Barbier escaped and ran to rescuers, where an employee phoned police about 3:17 a.m. When police approached the apartment at 3:39 a.m., they looked through the open door and spotted a

shotgun shell on the floor. Attempts to get the men inside to respond to verbal commands and telephone calls were unsuccessful. After a standoff that lasted several hours, four males — three juveniles and 19-year-old Brian Powell, who lives at the apartment — walked out and surrendered peacefully. Another two apparently left the apartment before officers arrived, Lanpher said. Police confiscated two 9mm pistols, both reported stolen, and a pair of marijuana pipes. No shotgun was found. A car belonging to one of the juveniles also was impounded and it will be searched for weapons and other stolen property.

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — The Kootenai County Joint Agency Task Force has netted two suspects and nearly 150 marijuana plants in a raid on a Cataldo residence. Michael Capps, 43, and Richard Wilson, 60, were arrested at their res-

idence Tuesday. They face felony charges of manufacturing and possession of a controlled substance. Following a court appearance Wednesday, Capps and Wilson were each released from jail on \$10,000 bail.

Veterans services job cut from budget

BOISE (AP) — Pressing ahead with their campaign to check the growth of the state government labor force, legislative budget writers Thursday eliminated the job of the Veterans Services administrator.

In picking what many predict will be a major fight with veterans organizations, the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee voted 11-9 to keep the agency in business but without longtime Administrator Gary Berneseolo.

The move would save \$92,000 in the agency's \$2.7 million general tax budget.

Eliminating the job has raised some questions since it is specifically authorized by state law. But it was the only possible way Berneseolo, who staged an unsuccessful 1976 challenge to Republican State Sen. James Risch, could be terminated without the consent of the Veterans Affairs Commission.

The committee also voted to eliminate the Commission on Alcohol and Substance Abuse and its director, former Democratic state Sen. Mike Black, saving about \$100,000. But it gave a reprieve to the Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing,

authorizing its \$92,000 budget for another year and keeping Director Pennie Cooper on the payroll.

Council supporters had lobbied members of the House-Senate panel intensely, as had representatives of the sheltered workshops for the handicapped. That also paid off as the committee voted 15-5 to add over \$60,000 to that Health and Welfare Department budget to cover inflationary costs.

Only one other agency, the Human Rights Commission, has won additional cash for inflationary expenses from budget writers.

Berneseolo, popular with veterans groups and an advocate on veterans issues, has run the agency through its expansion from the veterans home in Boise to a second in Pocatello and finally the newest one in Lewiston. "Each hospital has an administra-

tor, and this position simply travels between them," Republican Rep. Maxine Bell of Jerome said.

She said there was also renewed interest in relocating the agency from the Health and Welfare Department to the Military Division, which would preclude the need for an administrator. But legislation to do that has not even been drafted yet and there is only a month and probably less left in the session.

Batt had recommended elimination of both the Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse and the Council on the

Deaf and Hard of Hearing. Budget Director Dean Van Engelen maintained small agencies like these become advocates for special interests — something taxpayers should not finance.

But the committee's action on Veterans Services came as a surprise to key legislative leaders and Republican Gov. Phil Batt, who campaigned for leaner, more efficient government. Batt spokeswoman Amy Kleiner said the governor had not urged the move and had no immediate reaction.

Idaho Falls Police Chief Montague quits after 34 years with department

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho Falls Police Chief Monty Montague has decided to retire at the end of next month, 34 years after he started as a foot patrolman with a pocketful of dimes.

With no hand-held radio, he had to race to a pay phone to call for back-up. While Montague is proud of major

technological advancements and a slew of new programs that have been implemented in his seven years as chief, he said the daily stresses of the job have become more significant.

"I always said I'd retire when the job wasn't fun anymore," Montague said. "The job hasn't been fun for

the past couple of years."

Mayor Linda Milan said she doubted anyone would be appointed to succeed Montague before his March 31 retirement.

"I think we've got the best department," Montague said. "I feel really good about the time I've been here." But he said recently he spent too

much time "stomping out fires."

Montague mentioned the filing of a sexual harassment claim by one animal control division employee against another, as well as community pressure over fiers with racial slurs that were passed around the city.

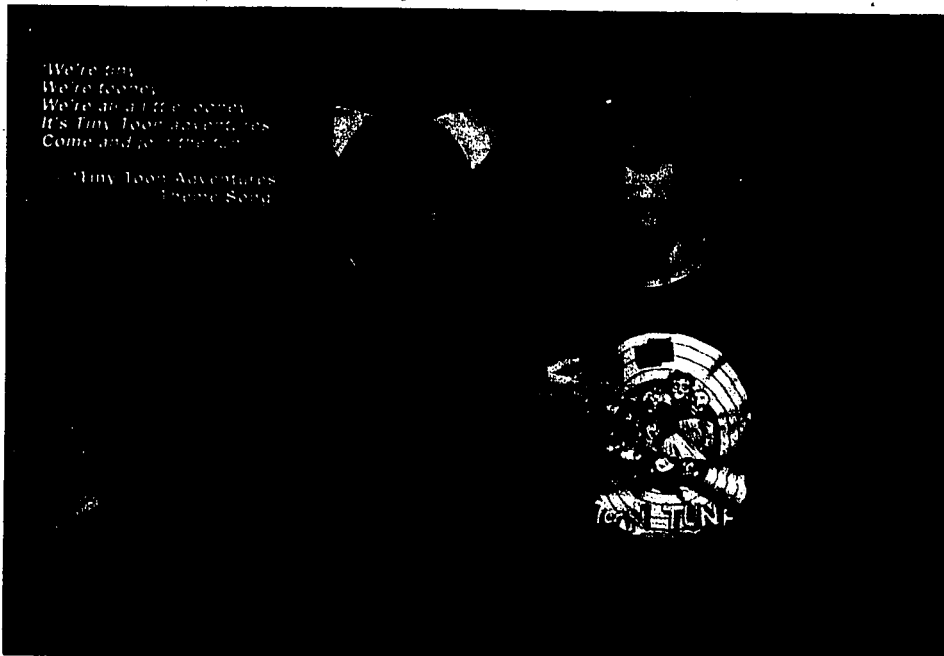

Revenge of the 'toons

Jump Company explores the wacky rhythms of animation

TWIN FALLS — Approximately 118 Jump Company kids, ranging in age from 5 to 18, are stacked freckle to freckle around the sides of their practice hall.

Their shoes are piled — no, make that jumbled — in the corner of the room. Everyone seems to have the croup. The level of chaos is about to hit a high note.

Nancy Strand is the director/mom. She's a very brave woman. She's also "everymom." Except that she has a microphone.

"It is now time to be quiet," Strand instructs her borrowed offspring over the loudspeaker. "You need to find it within yourselves to just be quiet."

That's what Jump Company practice is like. It's a miracle no one is hanging from the ceiling.

Instead, the older kids are trying to do their homework, while the younger ones are wriggling, and punching each other.

They have to learn more than two dozen songs by next week. Time is running out.

Practice begins with vocal warmups, as kids of all shapes and sizes blend their voices together — and come up with something that sounds amazingly harmonious. "About 75 percent of these kids have never been in a show before," said Strand, sounding surprised at the progress she's made.

Her assistant director is Dusty Blackburn, a college student who performed with the Twin Falls High School Madrigals last year.

Mark Koffer is general manager, Karmelle Nye is on the piano and Bonnie Eisen-Tario has been helping with the choreography.

Strand wrote the script. It's about a mom and dad who agree that it's Dad's turn to get up with young son for Saturday morning cartoons, just to share the excitement and fun.

Danny Loughmiller's playing the dad. Lisa Anderson is the mom, and Scott Valentine is the little boy.

More than 65 of the Jump Company kids have solo parts.

The show is a colorful song-and-dance romp through just about every cartoon known to kid. There are Bugs Bunny anthems and ancient (as in 1950s and 1960s) animation themes, featuring everyone from Betty Boop to Mighty Mouse to Woody Woodpecker to Pop-cye.

One tune is a wacky recitation of all 50 states and their capitals (like, educational).

Another segment showcases cartoon villains Cuccella D'Ville ("101 Dalmations"), Ursula ("Little Mermaid") and that annoying Gaston from "Beauty and the Beast."

The "Peter Pan" portion of the performance utilizes songs from the Broadway show ("I Won't Grow Up"), and the dreamy numbers include the movie favorite "Somewhere Out There."

From "Lion King," there is "Circle of Life" and "Can You Feel the Love Tonight?" From "Aladdin," there is "Arabian Nights," "Never Had a Friend Like Me" and "Prince Ali."

There's more, too, but it's starting to get a little noisy in here again.

When asked if she ever goes nuts at Jump Company practices, Strand replied, "I haven't yet."

Then she caught her breath and added, "Actually, these kids have been really good."

KETCHUM — Last fall, during the superheated debate over the anti-gay rights Proposition 1 on the Idaho ballot, a group of friends who opposed the measure decided to make their views tangible.

So they organized a new theater company. In fact, that's what they called it — and presented Seattle playwright Stan Dietz's "Lonely Planet," a cautionary tale about intolerance, as a fundraiser for the anti-Prop 1 effort.

The play was a hit; Prop 1 wasn't. "We'd actually been talking about forming a theater company for about six months," said Crystal Thurston, one of the three partners in the New Theatre Company. "We were interested in doing theater that was relevant to where we live and the issues that affect our lives. When the Proposition 1 debate came along, it was kind of a catalyst."

Four months later, the troupe is ready for its second production.

It's "A Perfect Ganesha" by playwright Terrence McNally, author of the Broadway version of "Kiss of the Spider Woman" and of "Frankie and Johnny," the play that became an Al Pacino-Michelle Pfeiffer movie. "A Perfect Ganesha" opens Wednesday and runs through Saturday, March 4, and then again on March 8-11.

"It's a play about a magical journey through India," Thurston said. "It's full of humor and understanding and insight."

If it's clueless, it's Grammy

Maybe the Grammy Awards should adopt Pat Benatar's "Hit Me With Your Best Shot" as a theme song.

Every year members of the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences try desperately to prove how hip they are and fail so miserably that bashing the music industry awards has become as tired as the show itself.

Perhaps it's time to try something different — praise the Grammys, not bury them. Praise them for giving long overdue recognition and career boosts to such artists as Bonnie Raitt and Eric Clapton. Praise them for keeping Southern gospel, tropical Latin and liner-note writing alive as awards categories. Praise them for allowing Placido Domingo to rub shoulders with Bruce Springsteen.

Nah. Once again, the Grammys have shown a frustrating ability to miss an exciting year in music. In the excitement and relevance, the awards show has been eclipsed by the MTV Music Awards and the annual Rock and Roll Hall of Fame induction dinner. But since those gold gramophones look so much classier than the ugly gawgaws dispensed by MTV, the Grammys aren't likely to go away.

By most measures, 1994 was a banner year for the business of music. The industry took in \$12

Hearing-impaired actors take stage

GOODING — The musical love story of "Beauty and the Beast" is not just for children.

Five-hearing impaired senior students in Gooding have tackled the play, based on the classic 238-year-old fairy tale by French noblewoman, Madame Leprince de Beaumont, to present to both hearing and non-hearing audiences.

"They were the ones that asked to do this for the public, to do what they called a real play," production assistant MaryAnn Batson said. "It's a love story. It has a lot of emotions. It's not Walt Disney with singing teacups. The story line is different."

As they rehearsed a humorous song Wednesday, the students signed each verse, smiling and swinging their arms in unison with the musical beat. They also did choreographed dance steps in unison.

Two of the five students can say their own lines, but none of them can actually sing. To voice their songs and songs, just offstage are five adult singers from the staff at the Idaho State School for the Deaf and the Blind.

Batson said this is the first time that ISDB students have put on a major play for the general public.

"The school has never done a pay-to-get-in production," she said.

Since early December, working around an abundance of conflicting schedules, the students and their voice helpers have been rehearsing to synchronize the timing of singing with signing.

"Beauty and the Beast" is great for signing actors, director Shelly Silman said. The students naturally use their body language to bring out the humor and heartache.

Beauty is the story's original version, Beauty for the general public. The oldest is a self-centered, cynical person. She is imitated by the second sister, who is a little more naive.

"Beauty is the youngest daughter," Batson said. "She's totally innocent. Sometimes you just want to shake her."

The girls' father is a hard-working man who has lost his fortune and now, with his daughters, eats corn consume every day.

The father receives word that his ship of riches has come in, and upon his departure, he asks each girl what gift she wants. The first wants jewels, the second wants a fancy dress, and Beauty asks that her father return safely.

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'Timecop' hits local video stores

Jean-Claude Van Damme, clad only in his underwear, leaps into the air and executes a perfect spilt onto a kitchen counter top.

It's absurdly impressive stuff. But how in the world could this behavior ever make sense, even in a far-fetched, sci-fi comic-style action-bonzanza?

Amazingly, "Timecop" manages to do it. It's one of the movie's invigorating pleasures making it a little more interesting than your average action picture.

Belgium-born Van Damme might fancy that "Timecop" could make people forget his lesser action-schlock stuff. Still, it's his best bid yet to make the leap that Arnold Schwarzenegger made with "The Terminator."

"Timecop" is nowhere near that good. But it does have a fun, imagination-sparking premise from screenwriters/comic moguls Mike Richardson and Mark Verheiden — the duo that also teamed for this summer's techno-magic comedy hit "The Mask."

Van Damme is the title character, a fiercely by-the-book enforcement officer who chases after bad guys going back in time to get rich with their knowledge of what's to come. Some see the futuristic equivalent of cops on the take, but Van Damme's Max Walker is a straight arrow with enough self-restraint to resist setting something right that went very wrong in his life a decade earlier.

The intertwined time lines, and a setting that leaps from the Civil War to today to the Depression to 2004, get a bit too confusing, though. I found myself making too many mental notes about changes in the movie's history as characters caused "ripples" in time, and losing some interest in the coiled plotline.

But whenever the story gets too tangled, Van Damme kicks into high gear with some sharply choreographed fight scenes.

Fans of Van Damme, action movies and science fiction probably won't be disappointed, though. "Timecop" may not be 90 minutes you can't wait to re-live, but you won't be frantic looking for a way to

Helga's mean, it's a Norwegian folk tale, and the Twin Falls High School Drama Department will bring it to life on stage next week.

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'Before Sunrise' X'ers, 24 hours in Europe

WASHINGTON — Jesse, the young hero of Richard Linklater's enormously charming "Before Sunrise," isn't having a very good time on his European vacation. He

had saved up to meet his girlfriend in Spain, but almost as soon as he arrives, she blows him off. Despondent but not yet ready to return to the States, Jesse (Ethan Hawke) buys a Eurailpass and bums around Europe for a couple of weeks until he's so tired of the scenery slipping past his window that he welcomes the arrival of his departure date in Vienna and the chance, finally, to go home.

But Jesse's luck is about to change. While approaching Vienna by train on his very last full day in Europe, he meets Celine (Julie Delpy), a French student on her way back to Paris, and after some brief, rather clumsy attempts at idle banter he invites her to the club car for some serious conversation. Soon these strangers on a train begin trading stories, sharing their dreams and secrets, their views on relationships.

death, romance and whatever else comes to mind. Their conversation is fractured and rambling, and perhaps because of their tender years, not terribly deep.

But there is also a touching guilelessness and eagerness to connect in their words to one another. And so, when the train arrives in Vienna, Jesse — whose plane doesn't leave until the next morning — makes a bold proposal: Get off the train with me here. We can walk around the city, taking in the sights, talking and getting to know one another. In the morning, I'll fly out of here, but at least we will have had an adventure together.

To Jesse's amazement, Celine accepts her new friend's offer. After stashing their bags at the station, the two meander around the city and, initially, most the way they bump into colorful eccentricities along the way — like the actor who plays a cow in an avant-garde theater piece — it looks as if Linklater might simply be content to apply the same loose, free-associative style he unveiled in

"Slacker" to an Old World setting — a sort of "Slacker in Europe."

But as the bond between the characters continues to blossom, the peripheral figures begin to recede into the background. At this point it might seem that the film begins to lose its personal edge to become a more conventional romantic story about young lovers on holiday.

But the movie is too talky, too exploratory — and ultimately too downbeat — to qualify as mainstream. As Jesse and Celine schmooze and gambol, they aren't just discovering each other, they're discovering themselves as well, testing their ideas about life and, perhaps, putting them into words for the first time.

Naturally there are conflicts. Celine, who seems the more mature of the two, is also a romantic — and with her long, tendrilily blond curls, she certainly looks the part of a fairy tale princess.

Jesse, on the other hand, is a born skeptic — and because of his recent flack in Spain, not particularly psyched about the possibility of true romance between men and women. For a time, this contrast of views creates a certain edginess and suspicion in their friendship — especially when Celine remarks that men should feel lucky that women let them live after sex — giving rise to the thought that maybe the adventure wasn't such a good idea after all.

Though Linklater allows the movie to wander, he never allows the pace to slacken, and more often than not he finds some unexpected bit of found poetry or cultural kitsch to make the digressions worthwhile. "Before Sunrise" is not a big movie, or one with big ideas, but it is a cut above the banal twentysomething love stories you usually see at the movies. This one, at least, treats young people as real people. (Liberty Theatre of Hailey)

'Nobody's Fool' Newman dusts off Oscar shelf

WASHINGTON — "Nobody's Fool" is a gentle portrait of a hamlet in "Ironwood" country, a little patch of peeling clapboard and worn black-top. The only tavern in town, the Iron Horse, is like the bar in "Cheers," only the interior is as dreary as the wintry landscape of New York state. There is an eccentric on every bar stool.

Every night or so, the boys gather for a round of poker and long-neck Buds. Sully (Paul Newman), the title character, usually loses because that's what he does. A penny ante construction contractor, Sully has spent most of his 60 years falling at things. He's suing the only guy who gives him work, Carl (Bruce Willis), who is a regular at the game along with Sully's one-legged lawyer (Gene Saks) and Rub — short for Rubber Head — the village idiot (Pruitt Taylor Vince).

Sully, who has a good heart underneath that crusty exterior, gives the slow-witted Rub work when he can and thinks of the perpetual child as his best friend. And why not? In most ways, Sully's still a kid himself. Then with the winter holidays come a first chance to grow up and become a father to the son (Dylan Walsh) he had abandoned as an infant.

Robert Benton, who also wrote and directed "Places in the Heart" and "Kramer vs. Kramer," has almost too much affection for this "Our Town"-like band of players. An adaptation of the novel by Richard Russo, the story is on the sticky side and the characters tend toward the adorably wacky. But Benton's unhurried pace suits the mood and should allow the actors, led by Newman and the late Jessica Tandy,

to take off their shoes and relax into the roles.

The trouble is, they never really do. We're always aware that we are in the presence of Great Actors. Newman, already making room in his trophy case for Mr. Oscar, is likable as a curmudgeon, but all the dirt in the world never transforms him into a working stiff. He remains the glamorous leading man.

Tandy, luminous to the last as

Sully's landlady, Miss Beryl, has a fine-tune that was sadly prophetic: "I've got a feeling God's creeping in on me. I've got a feeling this is the year he lowers the boom." But the role, her next-to-last, is a funny, life-affirming one — adjectives that also apply to the movie itself.

Whatever its faults, it is humble, adult fare and welcome in this age of grandiose children's games. (Twin Cinema)

TWIN FALLS — Everybody who wrote off the Jerome Tigers after they lost their first 13 games this season now needs to write them in at state.

The 6-18 Tigers, underdogs all season, will be going to the state tournament next week in Pocatello as a big underdog after they downed Buhl 53-42 in the District 4, Class A-2 tournament Thursday at the College of Southern Idaho gym.

TWIN FALLS — "Let me put the record on," said College of Southern Idaho coach Steve Irons. "This is the biggest weekend of the season to this point..."

Finally the last two games of the regular season are here and the rewards of victory are tangible. If the Golden Eagles beat Northwestern Colorado tonight they will host the Region 18 tournament March 1-4.

If they follow that with a win over Eastern Utah Saturday, they will have the league championship and No. 1 journey seed as well.

Given his drubbers, Irons will take the home court. The No. 1 seed is nice in that it moves a team away from the two-three teams but a look at this year's Scenic West Conference standings indicates little difference among the top four — CSI, Eastern Utah, Dixie and Ricks. 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Louganis writes about fear, illness

Flip side of courage: Recklessness

NEW YORK (AP) — Greg Louganis is sure that at first he was surprisingly calm when told he had tested positive for HIV, the virus that causes AIDS. Then he learned the details: His T-cell count was 256, alarmingly below the normal range of 600 to 1,200 and close to the cutoff point for full-blown AIDS.

"All I could do was nod my head," Louganis said in his new book, "because by this time, I could hardly hear anything except the pounding of my heart."

The diving and amateur sports community remained in shock Thursday following the disclosure by Louganis, who speaks freely of his contracting AIDS in a "20/20" interview with Barbara Walters to be broadcast by ABC on Friday night.

Anita DeFazio, who represents the United States on the International Olympic Committee, was saddened by the news.

"It's clear it's a plague that can come into anyone's house and the Olympic movement is no exception," she said. "I care about this athlete, who gave the sport so much."

Steve McFarland, president of U.S. Diving, saluted the two-time Olympic champion.

"Throughout his career as an athlete, Greg Louganis was an outstanding representative of both the sport of diving in general and the Olympic movement in particular," he said. "U.S. Diving shares in the grief felt by family, friends and fans of Greg Louganis. Our hopes and prayers are with him as he prepares for the future stages with this deadly illness."

Medical sources said there was little chance of that happening. "Such a tiny amount of blood in a huge amount of water is not really a risk," said IOC medical director Dr. Patrick Schamach.

Garner Werner, secretary of the international swimming federation FINA, said a special committee formed three years ago investigated the possible risks of blood in the pool caused by injuries in water polo matches. "It was clearly said that there was no danger whatsoever," Werner said. "There is absolutely no danger for anybody else in the water at the same time."

"The International Olympic Committee said Louganis did nothing wrong by keeping quiet.

"The fact is that he was under no obligation to disclose his condition," said IOC director general Francois Carrard. "And secondly, from all the medical evidence available, there was not the slightest risk of any contamination."

Louganis recalled the pool he fell after climbing out of the pool at Seoul and how O'Brien saw a trickle of blood coming down the back of his neck and pushed it back under his hairline. Puffer located the wound and stitched it.

"I was underwater before I realized I'd hit my head," he wrote. "Once I did, the first emotion I felt was embarrassment. As I swam toward the edge of the pool, I thought: What if I'm bleeding? Is there blood in the pool? In normal circumstances that wouldn't have been such a big deal, but these were anything but normal circumstances. It wasn't even vague to think that I might be badly injured. I was in total panic that I might cause someone else harm."

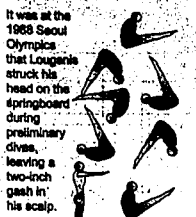
Louganis, 35, says in the book that he debated telling U.S. team doctor Jim Puffer about his condition before the Seoul Games but decided against it. "I was irresponsible for me not to do it." I didn't want him to have the burden of keeping such a difficult secret," Louganis said his coach, Ron O'Brien, knew of his condition.

When Louganis hit his head on the 3-meter board during preliminary dives at Seoul's Chamshil Pool, it opened a wound in the back of his scalp.

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Louganis' ultimate challenge: AIDS

Greg Louganis, the only man ever to sweep the diving gold medals in two consecutive Olympics, disclosed he has AIDS. He was HIV positive when he won two gold medals for diving at the 1988 Olympics.



It was at the 1988 Seoul Olympics that Louganis struck his head on the springboard during preliminary dives, leaving a two-inch gash in his scalp.

His knees bent as he approached the water. This is how the dive should have finished.

Diver Williams remembers days past

Wendy Williams remembers seeing Greg Louganis last summer at the U.S. Olympic Festival in St. Louis.

"He looked fabulous," Williams, a former star diver, said Wednesday. "He looked better than I've ever seen him. I noticed that because in the coming days, when he got into the pool ... that he was living life the way he wanted to."

Louganis does not look fabulous anymore, and he is not living the way he wants. He is 35 years old. His hair is closely cropped and streaked like the face of a pug.

He has AIDS.

Louganis, the greatest diver in history, spoke of his illness with ABC's "20/20." In the interview, he spoke broadly Friday night. Louganis says he was "not positive when he came out with his head at the 1984 Seoul Games and hid until the pool."

Williams, a bronze medalist at those Olympics and now a message therapist in Hawaii, was jailed when she learned Louganis' condition.

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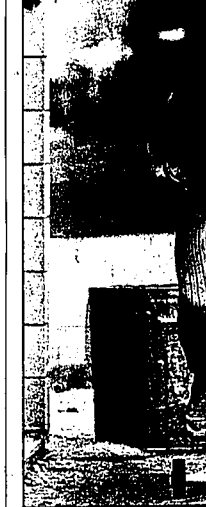

Players try to woo minor leaguers to their side

NEW YORK (AP) — Striking major leaguers and the teams tried to win over minor-leaguers to their side Thursday when San Francisco Giants' coach Bud Selig and other players tried to sway them to their side.

An Associated Press survey Thursday revealed nearly two-thirds of minor leaguers say they will boycott exhibition games involving replacement players.

"We expect our men to report to where we ask them to go to work," Red Sox general manager Dan Duquette said. "Some of them will be playing exhibition games here for us. Some of them will be major league games."

Union head Donald Fehr, who says anyone in a spring training game is a strikebreaker, sent a memo to all major and minor league

physicists and certified agents stating the policy of the players association.

"Major league spring training games in 1995 most definitely WILL BE scrub games because playing replacement players will mean they'll be replaced by the major leaguers who will be the only players," Fehr said in the Feb. 21 memo, which was obtained Thursday by the AP.

Players add, owners' legal counsel, Joseph P. Kamp, of St. Louis, Mo., says, "We're not going to let anyone else play for us." Fehr's memo says that the union is not playing exhibition games. Minor-league players plan boycott

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Nearly two-thirds of minor leaguers say they will boycott exhibition games involving replacement players, according to a survey conducted Thursday by The Associated Press.

Almost 63 percent of 269 minor leaguers questioned by the AP said they will head striking major leaguers and refuse to play when spring training games begin March 1. About 63 percent said they will play and 29 percent said they would not play.

Players were surveyed on 25 of the 25 teams. In most cases, 12 players per team were questioned. Players who already had signed replacement contracts weren't included in the survey.

"Minor leaguers have found themselves in the middle of the conflict, which culminated in 1994 on Thursday. Union head Donald Fehr declared anyone a strikebreaker if they play in scheduled exhibition games in connection with exhibition games for which contracts are being signed."

Minor leaguers are not members of the union, but they automatically join once they are placed on a 40-man roster.

The players who plan to defy the union often work the night shift.

"I've been involved in these strikes. I've been playing since 1979. I know what the union has done for me, which is honestly nothing," said Tom McCutchen, a 25-year-old right-hander for the Los Angeles Dodgers who has opposed the union's demands for higher pay.

"For somebody like me to play in an exhibition game, for somebody on strike to call me a scrub, I don't think they have the right to do that," he said.

Most teams have between 25 and 30 replacement players available to come out and minor league teams have said minor leaguers that they won't be punished for boycotting the games. Some teams, such as the Cincinnati Reds and Minnesota Twins, have said minor leaguers who refuse to play may be fined.

How will they go?

Players from each team who said yes, no, or were undecided when asked Thursday whether they will play in exhibition games during spring training. (Players not included are the San Francisco Giants, who will not use replacement players or play exhibition games, and the Toronto Blue Jays, who are not signing separate teams of minor leaguers and replacements. In some cases, 12 players could not be reached. Two Philadelphia Phillies could not be questioned Thursday.)

On 15 of the 25 teams, a majority of those surveyed said they would strike.

"I'm not trying to make any money," St. Louis Cardinals pitcher Michael Alexander said. "I just think it's in my best interest to do it."

Teammate Chris Norton, a catcher who hit 26 home runs last year as Class A Savannah, already has a contract to play for the Atlanta Braves.

"I'm dodging coaches," Norton said. "I don't know why they're doing this to me."

"I'm kind of a conformist when it comes to situations like this," said first baseman Andy Kotlarski, in his fourth year with the Minnesota organization. "I had my mind made up already, but it's good to know most people feel the same way I do."

Many players were angry to be caught in the middle, especially since they are not union members.

"Minor leaguers have a vested interest, too, but we don't have any representation," Milwaukee Brewers pitcher Scott Taylor said. "The major leaguers are talking care of themselves. The owners are taking care of us? I'm not part of the union and I'm not an owner."

In several cases, minor leaguers said they would grudgingly go along with the union's demand.

"No, as it stands now," said Justice Marshall, an outfielder for the Reds. "But, as I see it, the union's not paying our paychecks. I sure don't agree with them saying we'd be strikebreakers. All you're doing is helping the game out. You're not profiting or gaining anything from it."

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Poitier shakes out 'Dust' on CBS

As the dust settles on the vast plains of the Oklahoma Territory of the 1880s, thousands of lifeless bodies appear strewn about. Only one little Indian boy has survived this small battle, thanks in part to a gunslinging bounty hunter.

So begins the saga of forbidden love, prejudice and racism, and the deep passion for an untamed land, in CBS' "Children of the Dust." Premiering Sunday, Feb. 26, and concluding Tuesday, Feb. 28, the dramatic film centers around Gypsy Smith, a half-black, half-Cherokee bounty hunter.

Academy Award winner Sidney Poitier has the lead role of the gunfighter in a powerful story of his thoughtful and compassionate actions that touched the lives of many.

"There is an internal life to the character (Gypsy), but really of such a complex nature," Poitier says.

Through his life, Gypsy encounters many people of different races, good and bad, young and old.

During his travels he rescues the Indian boy he brings to the Indian Territory Agency run by John Maxwell (Michael Moriarty).

The role was a challenging opportunity Moriarty says he couldn't pass up.

John's presence (Poitier's) in the film and the project, and my own love of John Maxwell - I like him a lot because he's filled with flaws, but earnest flaws ... that's how I came to it," Moriarty says.

John immediately takes the young Indian boy under his wing, much to the chagrin of his wife, Nora (played by Farrah Fawcett).

The little boy, who is named Corby White, is befriended by John's young daughter, Rachel, but is instantly disliked

by John's stepson, Dexter. Corby and Rachel grow up together and fall in love, but the two are separated by the prejudice of the people.

Meanwhile, Gypsy takes on the task of helping a group of settlers claim some land in the Oklahoma Territory for an all-black town.

"I am fascinated with this period of the West," says Joyce Eliasson, executive producer/writer. "I know a lot of people came out of greed, and a lot of people came for adventure. But, I think these people, the freed slaves ... came for a better life."

In the group of settlers Gypsy encounters, Drusilla (Regina Taylor), a strong-willed schoolteacher, catches his attention. Gypsy finds himself doing the one thing he never thought he would do — fall in love.

"I had never seen a black woman as a frontier woman," Taylor comments. "In terms of blacks being part of the

Western migration, we don't know much about that."

Drusilla proves to be a match for the equally stubborn Gypsy. Taylor says she was fascinated by the strength and determination of her character.

"Because she has her own mind, because she has a dream of starting something new for herself, because she's independent, because she's strong-willed, you have a character that is of the magnitude of this Western epic," she says. "Because she has such great passion, that's really what got me."

Poitier is excited about the opportunity this film has provided for blacks to take on dramatic roles.

"I come from a time when it was an event to see a black person on television," he says. "It also came from a time when it was an event to see a black person on the screen in the theater that was not a representation of the stereotypical views of blacks at that time. I, have consequently been around to see the

changes. And there have been changes. There have been considerable changes."

The actor, who over the years has been careful about the roles he has chosen, says the challenging role of Gypsy is the kind of role he desires.

"I chose to swim against the tide," he says of his career. "I didn't expect to get this far. But, it was my nature to do so. I chose to articulate myself, and to distinguish myself, and to set myself apart by the quality of the work."

"Children" fits his standards of quality work. The well-written script and talented cast combine together to produce a heartwarming TV movie, which attracted Taylor to the project.

"In any project, I try and choose the best elements possible," she says. "As a producer, it provided the best elements: with the writing, with the producers, with the actors. It was a pleasure working on this from beginning to end."

Q: Crystal Bernard of "Wings" is our favorite actress. Who is the lucky man she is married to? —A.K.

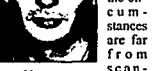
A: The 3-foot, 2-inch Texas native lives alone and remains happily single. Crystal, 30, tells me she has a lot of boyfriends and would have a hard time

A: Liam is about to be a father for the first time, although the circumstances are far from scandalous. The



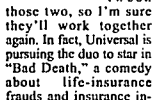

area where a number of celebrities live? —G.S.

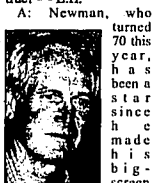

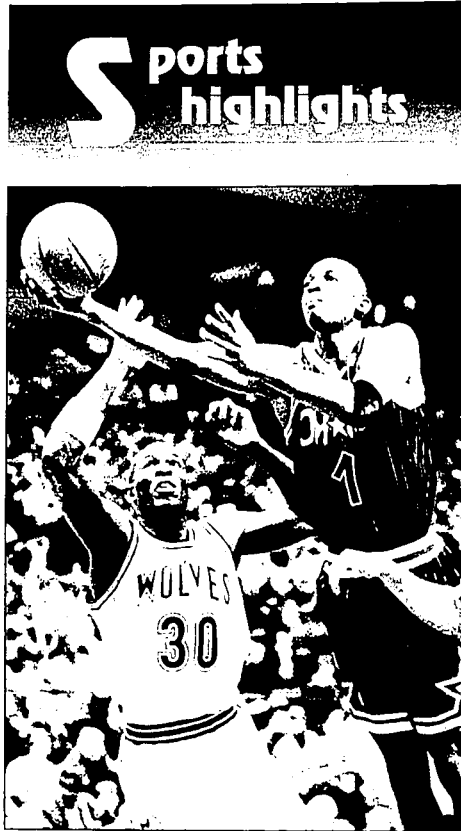

'Blossom' to fade from NBC picture

It's adios for "Blossom."

The 5-year-old sitcom will end its run on NBC this May.

The Monday-night series will end with an episode called "Goodbye," which was shot over the weekend.

"Blossom's" demise is not totally unexpected. While the show has generated strong younger-audience ratings, it has lost some steam in recent years. In fact, its season-to-date overall ratings are down 16 percent from its 1993-94 season average.

"All parties involved agreed it was time to end the series," said an NBC spokesman. "Blossom" has been very successful for NBC on Mondays. "Blossom" launched on Jan. 7, 1991, with young actress Mayim Bialik in the

lead role of the family sitcom. In the years since, both she and co-star Joey Lawrence have become teen faves.

When it goes off the air, 113 episodes will have been produced.

"Blossom" and its lead-in "The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air" have both had ratings problems this season. ABC moved "Coach" into the Monday spot earlier this season and Fox moved its young-skewing drama "Melrose Place" into the time slot, too. The recent launch of "Star Trek: Voyager" series has also taken viewers.

NBC Entertainment President Warren Littlefield recently cited the time period as an area he wanted to improve next season. NBC will test those waters in April when it starts a six-week run of "In the House," a new sitcom starring rapper LL Cool J and Debbie Allen ("Fame") in the time period.

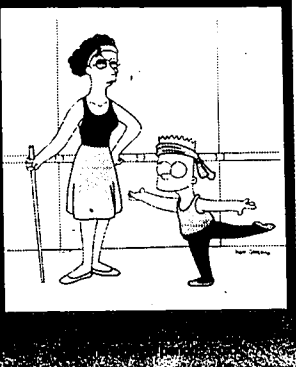

A Knight's Armor

The Age of Knights was hundreds of years ago. Knights were warriors in Europe from about 900 to 1500.

One symbol of knighthood was armor. Armor was protection in battle. Armor was also a status symbol.

Knighthood was around for hundreds of years, so a knight's armor got stronger and fancier as time wore on. With the invention of handheld guns, armor had to be so thick it became too heavy to be useful.

Well-suited

A well-fitted suit of armor might be quite comfortable. The weight (about 55 pounds) was evenly spread throughout.

Some armor fit so well that knights could leap into the saddle without even using the stirrups.

However, breathing and seeing were a little hard to do with the visor closed.

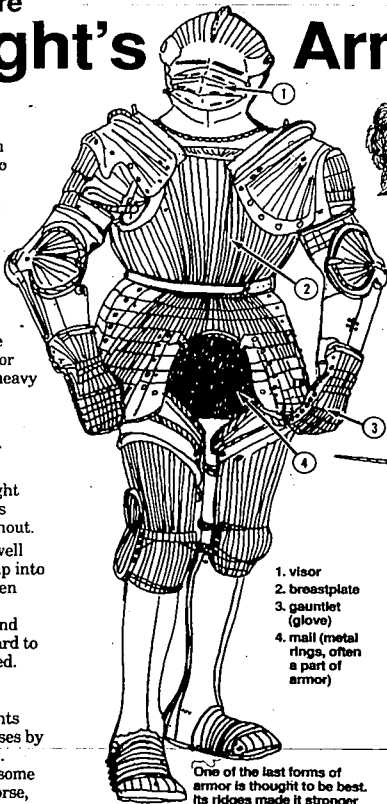


Knights wore padded cloth underwear.

Suiting up (on a horse)

We sometimes think that knights had to be hoisted up on their horses by a crane. Not so, an expert told us.

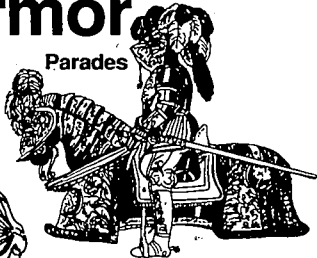
However, a knight might put on some pieces of his armor, mount the horse, and then, with help, finish suiting up.

4. mail (metal rings, often a part of armor)

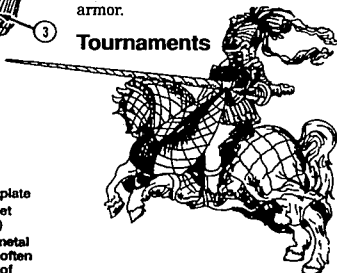
One of the last forms of armor is thought to be best. Its ridges made it stronger without making it heavier.

Some armor was worn only in parades. This was beautifully decorated and was meant to show the wealth and status of the owner. Sometimes even the horse wore armor.


Tournaments



Some armor was worn only for sport at tournaments. Tournaments were times for pageants, huge feasts, parades and contests.

One of the contests was the joust. Using a lance, or long spear, a knight would try to knock another knight off his horse.
