Craig: Amendment will return

WASHINGTON — Sen. Larry Craig, at the end of a five-week unsuccessful crusade to pass a constitutional amendment to balance the budget, vowed Friday to try again.

"The American people wanted this and the people of Idaho wanted this," Craig said after the vote.

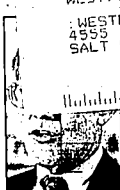
To the Idaho Legislature, which Craig said was vying to be the first to ratify the amendment, the Republican senator said: "Keep the resolution ready, we'll be back."

The measure failed in the Senate 65-35 — two votes short of the two-thirds majority needed for an amendment to the Constitution. Thirty-eight states are needed to ratify the amendment.

Craig's staff said the amendment has been the senator's dream since his days as a congressman in the 1980s. And his "tireless efforts to win support" for the amendment this year won him praise from Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kan., during a press conference following the vote.

Dole, although he supports the amendment, was one of two Republicans to vote against it. That lets him call for another vote next year because Senate rules allow for a recount when a lawmaker changes sides.

Amendment supporters seemed almost energized by defeat of the amendment — a core component of the GOP Contract With America. They immediately hurled it as ammunition against President Clinton and a handful of Democrats.

That issue was Social Security. When Republicans refused to officially exempt Social Security from the amendment, Democrats argued the GOP were out to gut the program to pay for other cuts.

Republicans denied the program was at risk, but declined to take Social Security out of the budget.

President Clinton and Democratic opponents of the amendment said it would also prevent Congress from borrowing money during times of recession or national emergency. During non-recession years, they also argued, Congress does not need to alter the Constitution in order to balance the budget.

Craig agreed Congress could still balance the budget by 2002 — the amendment's goal — without an amendment. But he pointed to a national debt reaching \$5 trillion as evidence that Congress needs the formal discipline a balanced budget amendment would provide.

And he predicted that in the next three or four years, the amendment would pass Congress. "There will be a few changes after the next election, with or without this issue and the new lawmakers will likely be more agreeable to this amendment," he said.

WASHINGTON — If members of Congress are serious about ending deficit spending despite the defeat of the balanced budget amendment, the next big battle will be over cutting benefits for elderly Americans.

The reason is simple: arithmetic.

So much of the federal government's spending goes to help elders that it's hard to imagine a way to move toward a balanced budget — as GOP leaders have vowed to do — without cutting back on programs for seniors.

After all, the federal government targets almost 11 times as much money on the elderly as it does on children.

according to the National Taxpayers Union.
Most public controversy since the Republican takeover of Congress has been over cutbacks to the poor, particularly children, but that's just a warm-up for the real battle, according to a consensus of economists from across the political spectrum.

"I think it will turn out to be an age dispute rather than a class dispute," said Barry Bosworth, an economist with the Brookings Institution, a moderate Washington think tank.

For instance, a GOP drive to end deficit spending by 2002 "would mean" they would have to reduce the size of the Medicare program by 30 percent

Twin Falls kidnapping case falls apart

TWIN FALLS — A California man accused of kidnapping was freed from jail Thursday — less than one week before trial.

Twin Falls County Deputy Prosecutor John Lothspeich dropped the first-degree kidnapping charge against David Rhodes, 27, of Pasadena, Calif., a charge which carries a maximum sentence of life in prison.

Rhodes and four other Californians were arrested Nov. 22 after a cell-phone toting Twin Falls woman pursued their van and alerted police that her 23-year-old nephew

had been abducted by the men.

Police chased the van at high speeds on icy roads, while bags of marijuana and methamphetamine flew out the van windows.

Three other defendants await sentencing after striking deals with Lothspeich and pleading guilty to aggravated-assault charges Wednesday and Thursday. In exchange for the guilty plea, Lothspeich dropped first-degree kidnapping charges against them.

Fifth District Judge Roger Burdick will be sentencing the three defendants, but no date has yet been set. The defendants are:

• Wilford Hicks, 30, of California. He

pleaded guilty Thursday to aiding and abetting an aggravated assault. Lothspeich said he will recommend two to five years in prison.

• Charles Jones, 26, of California. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to aggravated assault. Lothspeich said he will recommend two to five years in prison.

• Jonathan Marsh, 20, of Twin Falls. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to aiding and abetting aggravated assault; Lothspeich said he will recommend three to four years in prison.

The victim's credibility problem and the disappearance of a key witness are mostly

Idaho tribe has plans for 36-state mega-lottery

WASHINGTON — A Native American tribe from Idaho plans to announce next week the creation of potentially the largest lottery in the nation, setting the stage for a battle with states that fear their own lotteries will suffer.

The National Indian Lottery will be operated by the Coeur d'Alene tribe and Unistar Entertainment Inc., a Denver-based management company.

Idaho is among the 36 states in which the lottery would be available.

The lottery will be available through an "800" telephone number in 36 states and the District of Columbia. Callers will be able to

use credit or debit cards to buy chances at a jackpot that could grow into the hundreds of millions of dollars.

But states are already gearing up for a fight over the new venture. States predict it would not only eat heavily into their own revenues but would also create a regulatory nightmare.

"It's one thing for them to set up these games within their reservations," said Anthony S. Cooper of the North American Association of States and Provincial Lotteries. "But it's another thing for them to bring their gambling outside, into people's homes. Every house that has a telephone will have a lottery terminal, under what they're doing. I suspect many states will oppose this."

Amy Kleiner, spokeswoman for Idaho Gov. Phil Batt, said the state is aware of the growing controversy. But she said the state's hands are tied.

"As far as we're concerned, as long as they don't break any of our state laws we don't have much to say," Kleiner said. "We don't necessarily support the idea, but we're not going to start a fight over it either. Like the governor said, 'It's fair competition.'"

Richard G. Hill, chairman of the National Indian Gaming Association, said the opposition to the Coeur d'Alene lottery doesn't surprise him.

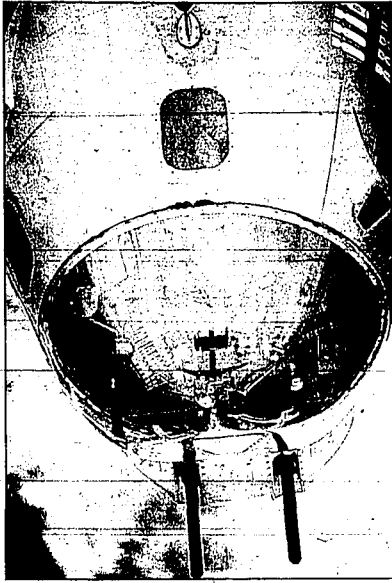
"They fight everything we do. Why not this?" said Hill. "The Coeur d'Alene has a lot to offer."

Sealife off California Coast grows sparse

WASHINGTON (AP) — Warming temperatures and the disappearance of a critical link in the food chain are turning the once-teeming ocean waters near San Diego into a dead zone, a researcher says.

John McGowan of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography at La Jolla said that since 1951 the water temperature off San Diego has increased by two to three degrees Fahrenheit and the population of zooplankton, a critical part of the food chain, has declined by 80 percent.

The lack of zooplankton leaves little food for many fish and birds and those, too, have been seriously hurt, McGowan said Thursday. "It already is pretty dead out there," he said. The scientist said he remembers an abundance of fish and bird life on scientific cruises in the 1960s and that on a recent cruise "I was flabbergasted at the difference."

McGowan and Dean Roemmich, also of Scripps, report in the Journal of Marine Research on Friday on the results of hundreds of thousands of water, temperature and plankton samples taken during 222 scientific cruises over the last 42 years.

The cruises covered the same sampling sites within a 50,000-square-mile area off the coast of San Diego and Point Conception, Calif.

Economy spurs air travel, steady prices for tickets

WASHINGTON (AP) — The improving economy should help fuel a steady growth in air travel in the next decade, the government said Thursday in a forecast that might hold more good news for passengers than for airlines.

Continuing competitive pressure is expected to hold ticket prices steady, resulting in a slight drop in the amount of money the airlines collect per passenger per mile, Federal Aviation Administration officials said.

Overall, the FAA said it expects 501 million domestic trips this year, and growth of about 4 percent annually, leading to 754 trips million in 2006.

And by 2017, traffic should double to about 1.1 billion passengers, added Linda Hall Daschle, deputy FAA administrator.

In addition, the agency said U.S. carriers will take 17.4 million travelers on international trips this year, forecast annual growth of 5.2 percent to 30.4 million by 2006.

The aviation forecast for 1995-2006 was released a day before air-

line industry officials were to gather for their annual forecast conference in Washington.

Most recent air-travel growth has concentrated among the newer carriers and commuter lines, said Robert Bowles, manager of statistics and forecasts.

As larger carriers downsize and restructure, commuter lines are taking over many of their short-haul operations, Bowles said.

That change results in a lower overall financial yield, since many small and newer carriers charge less per passenger mile than larger carriers, he explained. Bowles said those carriers will continue to be the focus of growth for the next couple of years.

While the industry in general is forecast to grow at 4 percent per year, commuter airlines are expected to increase 6.6 percent annually from their 58.4 million passengers this year. The forecast expects the money collected from fares to decline, when adjusted for inflation, from 12.93 cents per passenger per mile this year to 10.53 cents in 2006.

Measure would aid landowners

WASHINGTON (AP) — Plans by an elderly couple in Maine to sell some oceanfront property went awry when part of it was declared a wetland.

A Texas woman complained her 15 acres became almost worthless when developers lost interest after the discovery of the endangered golden-cheeked warbler.

Scores of such stories have been brought to Capitol Hill in recent months, adding to a debate over conflicts that arise when efforts to protect the environment collide with rights of property owners.

The controversy moved to the House floor Thursday as lawmakers began considering a far-reaching bill that would require the government to compensate landowners if a federal action — such as enforcement of an environmental law — is shown to decrease the value of property by at least 10 percent.

Rep. Billy Tauzin, D-La., who failed to get similar legislation heard last year but has found much wider support in the new Republican-led Congress, says environmentalists are "deadly afraid" because the ideas are so powerful.

The property rights legislation is a part of the GOP's "Contract With America" that House Speaker

Newt Gingrich is pushing to approve in the first 100 days of several bills aimed at curbing federal regulations.

A House vote on the legislation is scheduled for Friday.

Supporters argue that erosion of property values because of government restrictions — such as a declaration of a wetland or a stringent clean air requirement — amounts to a "taking" of property and the owner should be compensated.

The courts generally have said, however, that compensation is not warranted unless all of a person's property is taken — such as when land is taken for a highway.

Critics of the legislation say a broadening of the compensation requirement would spark thousands of claims against the government and bring environmental enforcement to a halt.

The Clinton administration has voiced its strong opposition to the bill, arguing that it could shatter agency budgets and would, in effect, pay people to comply with environmental laws. "It may require us to close parks, wildlife refuges or other lands," Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt wrote House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., on the eve of the House debate.

Man sentenced in Brink's case

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — A former Northern Ireland rebel drew five years in prison Thursday for hiding \$2 million from a 1993 Brink's armored-car holdup.

No one has been convicted of actually committing the \$7.4 million robbery, but U.S. District Judge David Larimer said Wednesday he believes Samuel Millar was "up to your eyeballs in this case." Millar received the maximum sentence.

Upon his release from prison, he faces deportation. Most of the Brink's money is missing, and investigators suspect it was turned over to the Irish Republican Army.

Budget experts say GOP plan may cut spending

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republican legislation to dismantle the federal welfare system would cut spending on social programs by more than \$35 billion over the next five years, congressional budget experts said Thursday.

The biggest savings in the GOP plan, according to an analysis by the Congressional Budget Office, come from deep cuts in programs that provide cash assistance to disabled children and elderly immigrants.

The budget analysis was released as the House Ways and Means Committee continues its third day of debate on the GOP legislation, which would repeal dozens of welfare programs developed since the New Deal and return the money — and the responsibility for supporting the poor — to the states.

The GOP's legislation also repeals the government's promise to provide a monthly check to single mothers and children whose income meets eligibility requirements.

Republicans, who released the budget estimates, say compassion can no longer be measured by how much money Washington spends on the country's poorest and most disadvantaged families.

"We're breaking the entitlement mentality of the welfare state," declared Ari Fleischer, a spokesman for the Ways and Means Committee.

Democrats continued to attack Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala called the GOP efforts "cruel blows to our youngest and most vulnerable citizens.... House Republicans aren't offering tough love or positive alternatives — they're offering cold shoulders and cruel indifference."

Democrats also insist the GOP is cutting welfare to finance tax breaks for wealthy Americans. "They're whacking the living daylight out of the social safety net," said Rep. Jim McDermott, D-Wash.

Democrats on the committee continued to try to reshape the bill with changes that were largely rejected, mostly along party lines.

According to the estimates from Congress' official budget analysts, the GOP legislation before the Ways and Means Committee would cut welfare spending by \$35 billion over five years.

Some \$6.2 billion of that comes from repealing a child care program that is included in separate legislation that consolidates child care and child nutrition programs into three separate block grants.

The overall savings of the GOP's entire plan, which also includes changes in the food stamp program, have yet to be measured.

Nearly one-third of the savings from the Ways and Means bill — \$10.2 billion — comes from cutting off health insurance and cash assistance to legal immigrants on the rolls of Supplemental Security Income, a program for the elderly and disabled.

An additional \$10.7 billion in savings

Skinhead brothers arrested

Pennsylvania teens face charges of beating, stabbing family to death

MIDLAND, Mich. (AP) — Two hulking skinhead brothers with Nazi tattoos on their faces were taken to court in shackles Thursday to face charges of beating and stabbing their parents and younger brother to death in Pennsylvania.

"They were people you had to be wary of," said Joseph LaComare, who lives two doors from the family's house in Salisbury Township, Pa. "You never really knew about what they would do, and people here were afraid of them."

Bryan Freeman, 17, and David Freeman, 15, were arrested Wednesday at a rural home near Hope, Mich., along with a cousin and another young man.

The brothers and the cousin, 18-year-old Nelson Birdwell III, were led into court Thursday with their hands and feet shackled and their arms held to their sides by a chain around their waists.

Judge James E. Wilson said the brothers are charged with three counts each of homicide and conspiracy to commit homicide in the slayings of Dennis Freeman, 54, Brenda Freeman, 48, and Eric Freeman, 11, whose bodies were found Monday.

Police say the brothers had threatened for years to kill their parents as revenge for trying to impose their strict way of life as Jehovah's Witnesses. The brothers collected Nazi paraphernalia and have neo-Nazi slogans tattooed on their foreheads.

The three made no statement other than to answer "yes" when the judge asked if they understood the charges and their right to an attorney.

Their court-appointed attorneys said the teens wanted extradition hearings on whether they should be returned to Pennsylvania; that process could take up to 90 days.

Wilson ordered the Freemans held without bail.

Birdwell was charged with car theft; his bail was set at \$150,000. The fourth person arrested Wednesday was released.

After the killings, the brothers were videotaped in an Ohio grocery store, then traced to an Ohio motel on a tip from a truck driver who recognized them. Finally, a Michigan State Police SWAT team stormed a home the brothers had called from the motel.

"I feel better now that they're caught. There's no more fright. We've been in fear of our lives," said the boys' grandfather, Nelson Birdwell.

"I want to see them dead now," he said. "I want to see them pay equal to what they did to my daughter and her family."

The brothers are an imposing sight. David stands 6-foot-3, weighs 245 pounds and has "Sieg Heil!" etched above his eyebrows. Bryan, who has "Berserker" tattooed on his forehead, is 6 feet and weighs 215 pounds.

The younger Birdwell, standing about 6-foot-3 and weighing about 240 pounds, also has "Berserker" tattooed on his forehead.

It appears the significance of "Berserker" is a neo-Nazi group the Freemans brothers were apparently attempting to form, said Lehigh County, Pa., District Attorney Robert Steinberg.

Steinberg said the Freemans' parents had sought help in controlling their sons from several organizations, including the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, which monitors hate groups; Toughlove International, a Doylestown-based self-help agency for parents with problem children; and the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission.

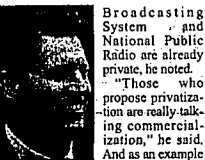
The boys' mother told police at those agencies that she was afraid of her sons and feared for her family's safety.

Gore, Mister Rogers decry plan to cut PBS

WASHINGTON (AP) — The proposal GOP leaders in Congress to eliminate funding for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting is part of a broad assault on programs that enrich children, Vice President Al Gore said Thursday.

"This attack is mean-spirited and it is dead, flat wrong," he told an audience at American University's school of communications.

He said the proposal, which has been put forward several times by House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., is in keeping with other GOP plans to cut school lunches, programs that teach children to read and summer jobs for youth.

"It doesn't make sense and it's a political mistake," the vice president said.

Gore said he and President Clinton see public broadcasting "as a sound investment and a sound federal policy and a great value."

Government funding for public broadcasting amounts to \$1.09 per citizen per year, he said.

"If you're Oscar the Grouch, that might be something to complain about — if you live in a garbage can and are an angry green male," he said. "But if you're like most Americans, you will see what a great value this is."

Gore suggested that the government create a stable, permanent source of public seed money for public broadcasting, "a stream apart from annual appropriations and insulated from politics."

Gore said he also disagreed with Republicans who have suggested privatizing the CPB. The Public

Broadcasting System and National Public Radio are already private, he noted.

"Those who propose privatization are really talking commercialization," he said. And as an example of what commercialization has done to TV, Gore pointed to a report Thursday about ABC's killing a children's educational program in favor of a cartoon version of the movie "Dumb and Dumber."

"That's really the issue," he said to applause. "It doesn't get any clearer than that."

Before the vice president spoke, Fred Rogers, host of PBS' long-running "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood," warmed up the crowd. First, he got the audience of about 250 to sing his theme song, "It's a Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood."

Then he spoke of communications as a gift, from Gutenberg's printing press making the Bible widely available, to Marconi's radio broadcasting music to people who might never get to a concert hall. He asked the crowd to be silent for a minute and think about those people "who might have been important to you while you were growing up. I'll watch the clock."

"For a long minute, the audience barely stirred."

"I go home to that neighborhood hearing your singing and seeing your faces," he said.

White House: Keep foreign broadcaster rules

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration wants to make it easier for foreign companies to invest in U.S. telecommunications businesses but not U.S. broadcast companies.

"We should not be too hasty in lifting restrictions on the amount of foreign influence over, or control of, broadcast licenses due to the editorial discretion of broadcasters over the content of transmissions," Larry Irving, President Clinton's top telecommunications adviser, told the Senate Commerce Committee on Thursday.

Irving's statement comes as momentum builds in Congress to repeal a longstanding foreign ownership statute and as the Federal Communications Commission considers ways to make it easier for foreign companies to invest in telephone, cable and broadcast outlets.

A House panel plans to look at a bill repealing the ownership provision Friday.

The ownership restriction generally prevents a foreign company from owning more than 25 percent of a U.S. broadcast or telephone company unless federal regulators determine it is in the public interest.

A high-profile federal investigation into the ownership of Fox Inc. has put the foreign ownership restriction in the spotlight.

The investigation by the FCC is in response to a 1993 complaint by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People that Fox misled the FCC 10 years ago about its ownership when seeking permission to acquire six TV stations that made up the foundation of the network.

Nevadans debate nuclear waste dumping in state

WASHINGTON (AP) — The governor of Nevada implemented Congress Thursday not to place both a permanent and temporary nuclear dump in his state, saying there is no impending national crisis regarding the storage of spent radioactive materials.

"The contrived atmosphere of urgency to which we are now having to respond is an invention of the nuclear power industry that would like to solve its own nuclear waste problems ... on the backs of Nevadans," Gov. Bob Miller testified before the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

Sen. Richard Bryan, D-Nev., agreed. "Nevada is being singled out as the sacrificial lamb for the nuclear power industry," he testified.

But Kevin Phillips, mayor of Caliente, Nev., said his city and the surrounding Lincoln County are willing to accept the temporary storage site if the Department

of Energy provides a \$100 million trust fund. The temporary dump would be near the tiny community of Elgin, 100 miles northeast of Las Vegas.

State officials are opposed to the temporary dump, citing a law that says the temporary site cannot be located in the same state where a permanent repository would be built.

State officials are opposed to the temporary dump, citing a law that says the temporary site cannot be located in the same state where a permanent repository would be built.

Yucca Mountain, 100 miles northwest of Las Vegas, is the only site being studied for the permanent dump.

The temporary site would store radioactive waste collecting at the nation's nuclear power plants until a permanent repository can be built. That is expected to be well after the turn of the century.

Clark's husband asks for custody of their children

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Prosecutor Marcia Clark's estranged husband has filed for primary custody of their two young sons, saying she is rarely home because of the O.J. Simpson case, the Los Angeles Times reported Thursday.

"I have personal knowledge that on most nights she does not arrive home until 10 p.m. and even when she is home, she is working," Gordon Clark said in court papers filed Feb. 24.

"I was always there for our children and assumed at least equal responsibility for their care," he said.

Clark sees his children, ages 3 and 5, two evenings a week and every other weekend.

"While I commend Marcia Clark's brilliance, her legal ability and her tremendous competence as an attorney, I do not want our children to continue to suffer because she is never home, and never has any time to spend with them," Clark said.

In court last week, Ms. Clark alluded to her desire to juggle a rigorous court schedule and parenting duties. Judge Lance Ito wanted to schedule a court session Friday night to interview witness Rosa Lopez but delayed it after Ms. Clark reminded him that she needed to care for her children that night.

This week, defense attorney Johnnie L. Cochran Jr. suggested the prosecutor had used child care as a ruse to delay the testimony of Lopez, who could help clear Simpson in the killings of his ex-wife, Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ronald Goldman.

Ms. Clark said she was "offended as a woman, as a single parent, as a prosecutor and as an officer of the court."

She filed for divorce June 9, only a few days before the double murder that would make her one of the nation's most visible prosecutors.

Denise Brown talks about Simpson kids

BOSTON (AP) — O.J. Simpson's two youngest children light candles every morning in front of a shrine dedicated to their slain mother, the dead woman's sister Denise Brown said on a visit to Boston.

"They know their mommy's dead, but we keep her alive," Brown said of the children, Sydney, 9, and Justin, 6. "We have a shrine for her and we light candles for her every morning, and we have a huge picture that a man gave to the DA's office for our family."

"It's a portrait of Nicole and it is so beautiful, it's so amazing. The sparkle in her eye, I haven't seen that captured ever. It looks like she's alive," Brown said.

Sydney and Justin Simpson have been living with Brown and her two children at the home of their grandparents, Lou and Juditha Brown.

Witness Rosa can't recall exact time she saw Bronco

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Calm and unwavering under relentless cross-examination, a Salvadoran maid stuck to her story about seeing O.J. Simpson's Bronco the night of two murders.

She admitted, however, that she can't pinpoint the exact time and never sought out police to tell them what she had seen.

In a courtroom packed with Simpson's family and supporters, a confident Rosa Lopez said she thought Simpson was "a great guy" and acknowledged she disliked his slain ex-wife because she once slapped a Simpson maid, who was a friend of Lopez.

As Deputy District Attorney Christopher Darden intensified his attack on the witness's credibility by suggesting she was offered money for her alibi testimony, Lopez frequently answered, "I don't remember."

That also was her response when asked if she told a friend and former employer she would testify to "anything, anytime in this case."

She denied discussing with fellow maid Sylvia Guerra payment for her story from the National Enquirer or the Simpson defense team.

"Isn't it true that you told Sylvia Guerra that you were going to be

paid to testify in this case?" Darden asked.

"No, sir," Lopez replied.

"And isn't it true that you told Sylvia Guerra that if she would say that she saw the Bronco that she could also get paid \$5,000?"

"I don't remember having said that, sir."

"So you could have told her that?" Darden pressed.

"I don't remember having said it, sir," she replied, then repeated that answer twice more.

Darden clashed with Lopez over numerous other issues, including her age, which she balked at telling on national TV. She said no woman

wanted to announce her age to the world.

After a full day of hard questioning, Darden still wasn't finished with Lopez, and the judge ordered her to return to court Friday.

In contrast to her demeanor last week, when she was tearful and distraught under intense questioning, Lopez was firm and forthright. She was clearly concentrating on giving brief, often one-word answers of "yes" or "no."

In addition to, "I don't remember," she also often replied "If you say so, sir" when Darden pressed her repeatedly.

Darden, his questioning more restrained than in the attack he launched on Lopez last week, picked up on the "Mr. Johnnie" terminology she used then to describe defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr.

On Thursday, in contrast, she referred to him as "Mr. Cochran."

Darden repeatedly suggested that Lopez's testimony was scripted by defense attorneys.

Asked by Darden if she met with Simpson's attorneys on a court break, Lopez said she had but that they didn't tell her what to say. Through an interpreter, the Spanish-speaking witness said, "We talked about my always telling the truth, sir."

Bank-buster detained in Germany



FRANKFURT, Germany (AP) — The British trader whose gambles led to the collapse of Britain's oldest investment bank was several steps ahead of a Singapore arrest warrant and almost home when police caught up with him Thursday.

Nick Leeson was escorted off a flight from Malaysia and detained by German police while authorities waited for an extradition request and arrest warrant accusing him of mishandling money and other charges.

Leeson repeatedly told police he wanted to return to Britain, where his employer, Baring Brothers & Co., was trying to figure out how one man could lose an estimated \$1 billion and bring down the 232-year-old bank in a matter of weeks.

In its first comment on the case, Singapore's fraud squad said Thursday it was investigating a complaint by Baring Futures that the 28-year-old Leeson "committed offenses of forgery."

It said the Baring complaint was made to police Monday, four days after Leeson and his wife, Lisa Simms, had already fled their luxury condominium in Singapore, leaving newspapers at the door and laundry drying on the balcony.

2-year humanitarian Somalia mission ends

MOGADISHU, Somalia (AP) — Guns trained to the rear, U.S. Marines backed into the sea Thursday with the remnants of a multinational force that fed thousands of Somalis but failed to conquer chaos.

The Marines escorted the final U.N. forces from Mogadishu's shores, a quiet end to a two-year intervention that began with a televised invasion and ultimately cost \$2 billion and the lives of more than 100 peacekeepers.

The last peacekeepers were hurried to off-shore battleships. The move of 1,500 American and 350 Italian marines from a small beach code back to their ships was expected to take most of the night.

American Marines landed Monday to protect the evacuation of 2,400 Pakistani and Bangladeshi peacekeepers, the last in a multinational force that once totaled 38,000 troops from 21 countries.

The withdrawal was delayed several hours when a ferry chartered to pick up the Pakistanis was rammed by a tugboat, damaging its cargo doors.

As the doors were being repaired, port officials found their only gang-plank was missing, apparently looted.

"Just give us ropes and we'll climb aboard," one Pakistani officer said. A makeshift gangplank was jury-rigged from shipping containers, and the ship left after a three-hour delay.

The couple drove across the border into Malaysia, where they spent the night, then went on to a ritzy resort in Kota Kinabalu, about 900 miles away on the island of Borneo.

Malaysia's Daily Express newspaper said Leeson went to Royal Brunei Airlines office in Kota Kinabalu on Tuesday, asked for the next available flight to Europe and paid \$1,500 cash for the tickets.

Zakri Abdul Rashid, director-general of Malaysia's Immigration Department, said Leeson's flight left Wednesday night before immigration authorities could act on a police request to detain him.

He blamed the delay on "timing," saying the department's computer system was not connected with all state immigration departments.

Daily Express assistant editor James Sarda said he tried to have the plane stopped in Bangkok, where it made a scheduled stop, but the airport duty-manager told him on the phone, "Please don't ask me to go to the runway and try to stop the plane."

Police carrying pictures of the couple boarded the plane when it landed in Frankfurt early Thursday. Leeson was taken into custody, but Ms. Simms was released and flew to Britain.

The couple's newly hired lawyer, Eberhard Kempf, said Leeson would probably spend the night in a Frankfurt prison before he was taken before a judge Friday where he was expected to fight on extradition request.

The lawyer said he had talked to Leeson's parents.

Asked a reporter if they had been happy that their son had been found, Kempf paused, and answered: "I don't think so."

Traders cheered and jeered when news of Leeson's detention flashed on a giant screen above the floor of Singapore's futures market.

Frankfurt's chief prosecutor, Heinz-Hermann Eckart, told a news conference that an international arrest warrant accused Leeson of falsifying a passport and mishandling money.

Eckart said the extradition process could take three months.

Singapore had said its request was based on a complaint by the Baring Futures company of Singapore that Leeson "committed offenses of forgery." The statement did not elaborate.

Eckart said to have made failed bets on which way the Tokyo stock market would go that cost the bank an estimated \$1 billion.

Pakistanis executed in sectarian massacre

KARACHI, Pakistan (AP) — Gunmen tied up and executed seven Sunni Muslim men Thursday, apparently in retaliation for the slaughter of Shiite Muslim worshippers last weekend, authorities said.

An eighth man shot in the head survived, and five women were beaten with rifle butts but were not shot, police said. The massacre occurred in a middle-class Karachi neighborhood near two Shiite mosques where 20 worshippers were fatally shot Saturday. Sunni and Shiite extremists have been waging sectarian battles the past year, leaving hundreds dead in the southern port city.

Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto's government and the police have been unable to halt the spiraling violence.

Ukraine endures syphilis epidemic

KIEV — Ukraine is facing a growing epidemic of syphilis, with reported cases doubling almost yearly since the Soviet collapse, a top health official said Thursday. Children in particular were afflicted. "Our health ministry considers Ukraine to be in the middle of a syphilis epidemic," said Felix Rynda, a treatment specialist at the All-Ukrainian Health Centre. Last year, 35,000 cases of the venereal disease were reported — more than triple the 10,000 cases reported in 1992. Most worrying was the escalating number of children affected with the illness. In three years alone, the number of affected girls under the age of 16 jumped eight times, and boys three times.

Court indicts ex-premier on mob charges

PALERMO, Sicily — Former Premier Giulio Andreotti, Italy's leading postwar statesman, was indicted Thursday for allegedly consorting with the Mafia. The court set a Sept. 26 trial date in Palermo for the seven-time premier, said an aide to Judge Agostino Gristina. The 76-year-old Andreotti, who has denied any complicity with the mob, becomes the most senior Italian official ever to face trial on Mafia charges. Andreotti has not attended any of the previous hearings in Palermo and did not appear today. Prosecutors have built their case, layer by layer, around testimony from Mafia turncoats and former members of Andreotti's scandal-ridden Christian Democrat party.

Pope reschedules U.S. visit for October

VATICAN CITY — Pope John Paul II, who canceled a trip to the United States last fall because of health reasons, has rescheduled his visit for October. The pope will visit New York City, Newark, N.J., and Baltimore on the Oct. 5-8 tour, the Vatican said today. The Baltimore and Newark archdioceses said the visit would be from Oct. 4-8. The centerpiece of the trip is a visit to U.N. headquarters in New York on Oct. 5 to mark the organization's 50th anniversary. Cardinal John O'Connor, who will be the pope's host in New York, said details of John Paul's itinerary would be released later.

Study: Smoking increases diabetes risk

LONDON — Pack-a-day smokers are twice as likely as non-smokers to get adult-onset diabetes, but moderate drinkers run a lower risk than teetotalers, according to a study of more than 40,000 men. Although doctors have long known that diabetics are particularly susceptible to the ill effects of smoking, this is one of the few studies to show the converse: healthy people who smoke are more likely to get diabetes. "The message for smokers clearly is to stop, and you may also want to ask your doctor to check you for diabetes," said Dr. Eric Rimm, the leading investigator from Harvard School of Public Health. "For alcohol," said Rimm, "this is one additional piece of evidence ... that shows that moderate drinking is okay among people who can control their consumption."

Relatives search rubble for dead

GROZNY, Russia — Relatives and volunteers searched open graves and the rubble of bombed-out buildings Thursday for the bodies of thousands of soldiers and civilians who died in the battle for the Chechen capital. About 400 bodies lay heaped in three large open pits next to a Russian cemetery in northern Grozny, awaiting mass burial unless someone claims them. Gazing over them was a statue of a square-jawed Soviet soldier, a memorial to the dead in World War II. Russia's Ministry of Emergency Situations is using earth-moving equipment in Grozny to extract bodies from the rubble.

Nobel Prize winner Koehler dies at 48

FREIBURG, Germany — Georges Koehler, who shared the 1984 Nobel Prize for medicine, has died at age 48. He died Wednesday of a lung infection, Freiburg University said. Koehler was director of the Max Planck Institute for Immune Biology at Freiburg, where he studied before he began working in the 1970s with Cesar Milstein at Cambridge in Britain on the fusion of white blood cells. They developed a method of producing large quantities of monoclonal antibodies, which have many uses in diagnosis and treatment of illnesses. Koehler and Milstein shared the Nobel Prize along with Niels K. Jerne.

Farm workers deserve better from Legislature

Having delayed action a full year for study and cogitation, the Idaho Legislature should have been ready this year to give farm workers the basic protection of workers' compensation insurance. Instead, the House crumbled this week under the resolve of the farm lobby.

The decision was disappointing. The lopsided vote (43-27) was disappointing. The fact that of the Magic Valley's 10 representatives, only Doug Jones and Wendy Jaquet voted "yes" was disappointing. And finally, Gov. Phil Batt's failure to fight for a concept he had endorsed was disappointing.

To supporters of the workers' comp proposal, the issue was simple: Farm workers, toiling in one of the world's most dangerous occupations, desperately need the simple protection that other workers enjoy. They deserve a guarantee that, if they are hurt at work, they won't have to choose between crushing medical bills and letting their injuries go untreated.

But opponents succeeded in painting the issue as too complex for the Legislature to settle this year. "There's a problem here, and agriculture does need to sit down and work this out, but this bill seemed to be

one-sided," said Rep. Tim Ridinger, R-Shoshone. Both sides, he said, both sides need to "give a bit" and settle on a bill that everyone could live with.

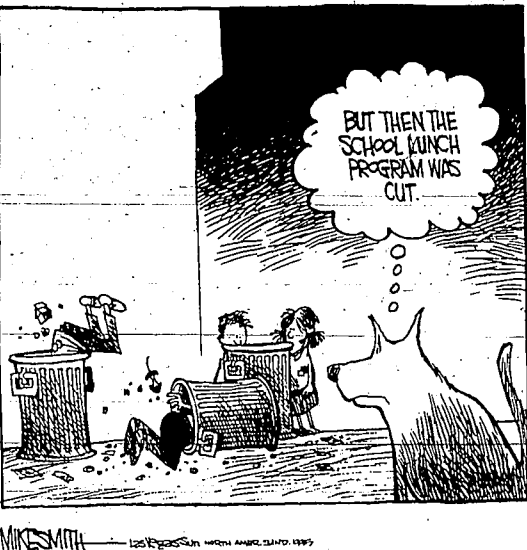
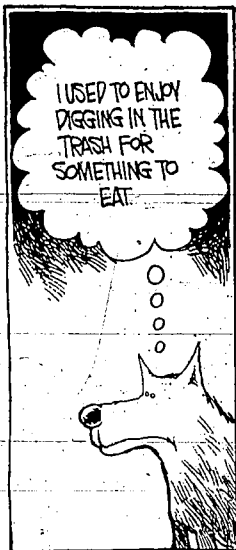
Maybe. But sitting down and working things out was the assignment given to last year's study committee. And as of January, when the current legislative session started, committee members were under the impression that they had done their job. They had reached a compromise; the smallest farms would be exempted from mandatory coverage.

That compromise turned out to be not good enough for farm organizations. They wanted a strictly voluntary program. In other words, they wanted a program that would allow farm workers to remain unprotected.

Maybe further study and further negotiation will yield a satisfactory conclusion. But we're not hopeful.

It appears that as long as farm groups remain committed to leaving workers at risk, and as long as the farm lobby retains its clout with the Legislature, farm workers cannot expect meaningful help from Boise.

Idaho's farm community is full of humane, generous and fair-minded folks. But this vote did nothing to reinforce that reputation.



Hunters aim to manage wildlife resources

Recently *The Times-News* printed an editorial critical of the "hunters rights amendment," now known as HJR-10. This editorial did not represent the viewpoint of Idaho's hunters.

Idaho's hunters are not trying to get rid of "pesky animal lovers." We are trying to preserve the idea that our wildlife resources are renewable and valuable and that part of the scientific management of those resources is hunting. The real danger of the animal rights movement is based on the assumption that animals are more important than people.

The sportsmen of Idaho should not underestimate the threat of the animal rights movement in Idaho. This small group of anti-hunters will be well-financed by out-of-state money.

Arizona was the first Western state to face an anti-hunting initiative (Proposition 201) which would have stopped hunting, fishing and trapping on all federal lands. Sportsmen spent almost \$1 million and defeated this initiative. Two years later, anti-hunters introduced another initiative that would ban trapping in Arizona, and it passed!

Animal rights groups have been active in California as well. They tried to ban black bear hunting via use of the legal system. When this failed, they turned to the initiative

commissioners and the Legislature created a Black Bear Task Force to examine the black bear population of Idaho. This group was made up of hunters, non-hunters and anti-hunters. After many hours of discussion, this group recommended that no single method of hunting would be eliminated, but that the Department of Fish and Game would cut back on the number of bears taken during hunting seasons.

This was not the "victory" the animal-rights people wanted, so they next approached the Legislature with a bill to ban bear hunting. This group could not get a legislator to sponsor its bill. So now we have this same group circulating a petition to get its anti-hunting idea on an initiative for the 1996 election in Idaho.

We should know by now that the public initiative is a successful weapon used to ban hunting when other tactics fail. The public initiative is a process used by less than half the states. Wildlife management by public resources. The animal rights movement's history shows that it intends to chip away at trapping, hunting and fishing until they are destroyed.

Officials ignore illegal water use

Previous letters to the editor, as well as irrigators and dairymen who attended an October 1994 Idaho Department of Water Resources meeting, called on IDWR to do something about illegal use of water by dairies. IDWR, in its infinite stupidity, has done nothing about even the one dairyman who has admitted on public record to stealing water. Second, IDWR's official response in December is to require that all domestic wells have a casing limit of 6 inches. If you mount two 7.5 horsepower deep-well pumps together in a 6-inch casing well, you can pump 129,600 gallons per day, no permit necessary.

The easy solution to this problem would be to have these wells on the new metering program that most other "farmers" are (not) voluntarily and without complaint abiding by? But no, not the dairymen; we don't use much water, their big lagoons are really trout ponds.

Two letters have called on Lewis Eilers, chairman of United Dairymen, to back up his statement that dairies don't use much water. Here's letter No. 3, Mr. Eilers! At 35 to 50 gallons of fresh clean water per cow per day, which, when mixed with feed then turns into 85 pounds of feces and urine that will eventually end up in the Snake River via the aquifer, I can see why you choose not to respond. On average, excluding household(s) uses and lawns, the maximum number of cows on a domestic well should be 309. The average dairy around here is 600 cows.

IDWR's new 6-inch maximum casing "law/policy" says it will not issue a permit

unless "the well owner acknowledges in writing that use of the well for any other purpose requires approval by Water Resources and that failure to comply is a violation of Idaho Code." That doesn't say it is going to enforce it, heaven forbid, especially with a track record of not doing anything about a confessed and arrogant water thief. The "law/policy" also says, "Permits that propose greater uses than those authorized should be conditioned such that the owner will measure and annually report diversion amounts to the department."

Right if they're going to steal, do you think they're going to tell you about it? Is Dumb 101 a required course in college now in order to write bureaucratise. Response?

Kids speak: Television does affect their lives

For three decades, adults have argued over the quality of television programming and its effect on children. Now the children have spoken and, as usual, their perception differs from the grown-ups'.

In a remarkable survey of children between the ages of 10 and 16, the Los Angeles polling firm of Fairbank, Maslin, Maulin and Associates learned that one-third of the kids "often" want to try what they see other people doing on television, while two-thirds said their peers are influenced by what they see on the tube.

This directly challenges what many network executives and programmers have said. They have claimed there is no connection between what children see on television and antisocial or personally risky behavior.

At the same time, the networks have assured advertisers that if they will fork over \$1 million for a 30-second commercial during the Super Bowl, they'll sell plenty of beer, tires, cars and other products to viewers.

Which is it? Why does persuasion work with commercials but not with programming?

The survey shows that television has a more profound impact on the lives, values, ethics and morals of the young than perhaps even television's greatest critics thought.

And the kids in the survey handed down a two-count indictment. The first was against the television industry. The second was against their parents.

Sixty-five percent said programs like "The Simpsons" and "Married... With Children" (both Fox Television Network shows) encourage children to disrespect their parents.

Sixty-two percent said sex portrayed on TV shows and in movies influences kids to have sex when they're too young (77 percent said there is too much sex before marriage on TV).

That television has replaced parents as the primary shaper of young lives was revealed by this statistic: 82 percent said TV should help teach children right from wrong.

The survey indicated a clear breakdown of parental authority and informed leadership. Fifty-five percent of those surveyed said they usually watch television alone or with friends, but not with their family.

Forty-four percent said they watch something different when they're alone than when their parents (25 percent) choose the moral sewer known as MTV). Sixty-six percent said they live in a home with three or more television sets, and 54 percent have a TV in their own rooms.



A further message for parents is that more than half reported watching television more than two hours a day, but three-fourths said that if they could choose between television and spending more time with their families, they'd choose family time.

But where are mom and dad? If they're not divorced, they're working too much (see the March 6 Newsweek cover story titled "Exhausted").

When they are home, TV is frequently used as a baby sitter or distraction so parents don't have to communicate with their children.

The art of dinner conversation appears nearly lost. And the networks are happy to fill the void with programming that appeals mostly to the glands and not the head or the heart.

Entertainer Steve Allen tells me, "My first reaction is that we should take this information and beat the network TV executives over the head with it."

Allen says the best way to influence network programming is to write letters to network presidents, asking them whether they would let their grandchildren, nieces and nephews watch the shows they're putting on for other children.

He sees some hope in the survey, "because the kids are obviously picking up some moral values from someplace other than TV."

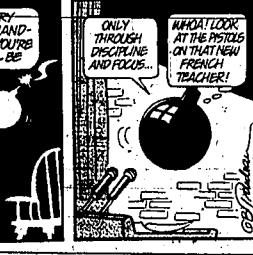
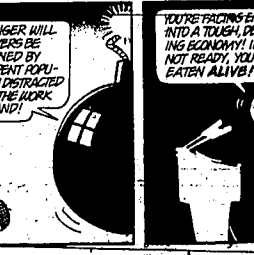
If you pour toxic chemicals into the water supply, public health eventually will be affected. If intellectual and moral effluent is dumped into the public airwaves, it has a corrosive effect on public taste.

Last year, Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill., persuaded the four commercial television networks to be guided by "independent auditors" who would watch for "excessively violent" programs.

That audit is ongoing, but the latest poll of children is a wake-up call for parents to monitor more closely their children's lives and to be as concerned with what is going into their minds as the quality of food and water they consume.

Ed board director up for Mississippi job

Cleere is leaving to become a professor at the University of Southern Mississippi.

Barton, whose focus has been higher education although the state board also oversees public schools and vocational education, is a native of Walker County, Ala. He said he received a bachelor's degree from the University of Alabama in 1969, a master's degree in 1971 and a doctorate in 1978.

Man says he lied about gasoline attack

COEUR D'ALENE — A Post Falls man admitted on Thursday that he lied when he told police an attacker poured gas on him and came close to lighting him on fire.

Kootenai County Sheriff's Lt. Ben Wolfinger said Wilmer Luhneden admitted fabricating the story.

But Wolfinger said the department is referring the matter to mental health services rather than pursuing criminal charges.

Sunshine Mining to close silver refinery

KELLOGG — Blaming low prices and falling production of silver, the Sunshine Mining Co. says it will close its Big Creek refinery indefinitely and lay off 14 workers next month.

The refinery had operated at only a fraction of its 30-ton-a-day capacity, Harry Coughler, vice president of the Boise-based company, said Wednesday in announcing the closure.

Shutdown procedures will start immediately, but the refinery will be held so that it can be brought back on line quickly, should prices rebound or additional silver deposits be found, he said.

The shutdown won't affect two shifts at the Sunshine Mine, where workers are exploring the West Chance silver deposit in hopes of finding more ore, Coughler said.

I-86 car crash kills Fort Hall woman

AMERICAN FALLS — A one-car crash on Interstate 86 near the American Falls exit has claimed the life of a 24-year-old Fort Hall woman.

State Police said Vicky Begay apparently fell asleep at the wheel about 5:11 a.m. Thursday. Two passengers in her vehicle were treated at a local hospital and later released.

NIC paper cartoon brings complaint

COEUR D'ALENE — A cartoon in the latest issue of the Sentinel, the North Idaho College newspaper, has raised a sexual harassment complaint.

A female member of the Sentinel staff considered the cartoon inappropriate and registered a complaint with the campus' sexual harassment committee, according to Steve Schenk, dean of college relations.

The complaint reportedly felt the cartoon denigrated the Center for New Directions, a campus program that had helped her. The Center for New Directions assists both men and women. Center staff reportedly were not offended by the cartoon.

Powerball pot reaches near-record levels

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — The Powerball jackpot could set a national lottery record if nobody hits it this weekend, but director Charles Strutt said the estimated \$100 million prize will likely be claimed before it has a chance to rise.

"If nobody wins, that puts us in unknown territory. We'd probably start with a conservative number and watch it rise from there. It could just take off. It would be at least in the \$130 million range," Strutt said.

The nation's largest lottery jackpot was \$118.8 million in the California lottery. The prize was split 10 ways in April 1991.

The \$100 million Powerball prize is the multistate game's third highest jackpot, the largest being \$111 million won by a Wisconsin teacher in the summer of 1993. There also was a

\$101 million jackpot claimed last November.

Strutt said at least 50 million of the \$1 Powerball tickets will be sold before Saturday's drawing. Each ticket has one chance in 55 million to win.

If 50 million were sold and each had a different combination of numbers, the chances of somebody winning the prize would be 90 percent. But many tickets have the same combinations. Strutt estimated that only about 60 percent of all possible combinations will be covered,

meaning there is a 40 percent chance that nobody will win. "Saturday night should do it," he said.

Powerball players pick five numbers from a set of 45 and a second number from a separate set of 45.

Thirty cents of each Powerball ticket are devoted to the jackpot and 20 cents go to secondary prizes, including the runner up \$100,000 prize for hitting just the first five numbers. Participating states get 32 cents, the retailer gets 5 cents and 13 cents goes

to advertising, administration and other costs.

None of the tickets sold for Wednesday night's drawing matched all six numbers drawn, which were 16-19-20-21-35 and Powerball 33.

There were 21 winners of the \$100,000 prize Wednesday. There were four each in Iowa and Minnesota, three in Missouri, two each in Arizona, District of Columbia and Wisconsin and one each in Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky and Oregon.

Micron delays expansion site pick again

BOISE (AP) — Micron Technology Inc. announced late Thursday that it is again delaying the announcement of the site for its \$1.3 billion expansion.

The company said in a terse statement that the decision between Oklahoma City, Omaha and Utah County, Utah, could be delayed until the end of next week.

The computer chip maker had originally said it would announce the site selection last Wednesday.

But the competing states have continued to up the ante in financial incentives to lure the expansion and the up to 4,000 new jobs that would come with it.

Four Idaho sites were ruled out earlier this year after the state refused to create an independent engineering school in Boise as Micron had demanded, offering \$6 million to the state in what one official called nothing more than a bribe.

But it was the same tactic the company used in the late 1980s when it enjoyed the state into building a \$10.5 million School of Technology in Boise to keep a major plant expansion in the city at that time.

Idaho Budget plan favors 1 charity

BOISE (AP) — Legislative budget writers showed preference to only one private charity again Thursday, voting to shell out \$69,000 from taxpayers to the Epilepsy League of Idaho.

"How come we take care of epilepsy but we don't take care of autism or heart or anyone else?" House Appropriations Chairman Kathleen Gurnsey, R-Boise, asked her colleagues.

But she already knew the answer. "It's called lobbying," Gurnsey told the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee. "They were effective in getting this program established."

It was the fifth straight session, the House-Senate panel has made what essentially is a donation to the nonprofit charity, a practice begun in 1991 by former Republican state Sen. Lee Staker of Idaho Falls.

"I have a request from 12 different agencies," Gurnsey said. "Why don't we let them all share in this, give them each \$5,000?"

But unlike past sessions when the contribution has been formally challenged, the committee simply voted 13-6 to continue it another year. Joining Gurnsey against the gift were Republican Reps. Bob Geddes of Preston and Dan Mader of Lewiston and GOP Sens. Dean Cameron of Rupert, Stan Hawkins of Ucon and Atwell Parry of Melba, the finance chairman. Republican Sen. Joyce McRoberts of Twin Falls did not vote.

Although Republican Gov. Phil Batt included the \$69,000 for the Epilepsy League in his 1996 budget blueprint, administration budget director Dean Van Engelen has said it probably should have been eliminated and would likely be a target of the spending ax in the 1997 budget.

But while the budget committee kept that money intact, it stripped \$45,000 from Batt's proposed \$10.8 million aid package for the community colleges in Twin Falls and Coeur d'Alene. The reduction was made to remove cash earmarks to cover inflationary expenses since no inflationary adjustment was specifically included in the university aid package.

It was the second straight year that efforts by Republican Sen. Dean Cameron of Rupert and GOP Rep. Maxine Bell of Jerome to secure as much cash as possible for their community college have essentially backfired.

But the committee did exceed Batt's tightfisted budget plan in several areas. It added a clerk to handle inmate education records in the prison system, an assistant for the director of the council that works to help disabled people live independently and \$300,000 more than Batt wanted for general vocational education programs.

"Vocational education is the area we should do a lot better on," Republican Rep. James Lucas of Moscow said. "People go get jobs after this. Seventy-five to 80 percent of our people don't get or have no use for a college degree."

Militia to Otter: You've been duped

BOISE - Lt. Gov. Butch Otter, the state Legislature and Idaho's top officials have been duped by those who are quietly plotting to throw out the U.S. Constitution.

That's the message that Otter received Thursday when he spoke to a United States Militia Association meeting in Boise. Otter, the state's second-highest elected official was planning to give a 20-minute speech on "states rights."

Instead, he got an earful during a 90-minute audience with the conservative organization, whose members wear military style attire and advocate creation of a national militia.

Carrying copies of legislative proposals - and John Birch Society magazines - USMA members warned Otter that a September "Conference of the States" - called to demand states rights, is actually an attempt to over-

throw the nation's founding laws - or at least an attempt to encourage amendments that would radically alter the constitution.

When Otter defended the Conference - and the lawmaker who endorsed it - Sherwood told him: "You've been tricked Butch. You've been tricked. A lot of you have been tricked."

Audience members criticized Otter for not being more familiar with pending legislation - and said Idaho's leaders must be more forceful when confronting Washington, D.C.

Sherwood, his voice rising sharply, said, "What we need is a governor, lieutenant governor and secretary of state with the guts to say 'Federal government get out of our lives.'"

Otter, refusing to back down, responded, "We are. We may not be doing it at the top of our lungs, but we are."

Thursday was the first time Otter has attended a militia meeting in Idaho.

"No matter who the group is or what the group stands for... I think the government needs to be accessible to you," Otter said, explaining his presence.

During his speech, Otter covered U.S. Sen. Larry Craig's balanced budget amendment, private property rights, the 10th Amendment, and the National Rifle Association.

Otter criticized the militia association for not supporting the NRA and told them he is a lifetime member of the organization.

"I think the NRA had a hell of a lot to do with the revolution we went through on Nov. 8 - without firing a gun shot and without wasting a pound of gun powder," Otter said.

He encouraged militia members to obey the law, to keep the peace and to maintain a positive approach.

"You've got a high purpose. Maintain the high road," Otter added.

Though civil rights activists have expressed concerns about militia organizations, Idaho's leaders don't appear troubled by the movement. Otter is the third Republican leader to address the organization in recent weeks. Last month, Secretary of State Pete Cenarrusa and state Schools Superintendent Anne C. Fox spoke to the group.

While Otter steadfastly refused to endorse the organization, he told the audience: "A lot of you people helped me (get elected), and I appreciate it."

While militia association leaders challenged Otter repeatedly, they also made it clear they were glad to have him on hand. "You've a brave man," Sherwood told Otter.

"Hell, I'm amongst friends," the lieutenant governor responded.

"More so than you know," Sherwood said.

Bliss students learn Middle-Age chivalry

BLISS - A gallant knight fell to his knees after a blow from his opponent's sword, and bleachers full of young Robin Hoods, princesses and sorcerers cheered.

"The kids love it," elementary school teacher Linda Ruby said. Bliss elementary students have been studying the Middle Ages.

After two weeks of building castles, making costumes, hearing stories and reading books about European life a dozen centuries ago, Bliss students were treated Thursday to a live demonstration by members of the Society for Creative Anachronism - a part of school's Medieval Festival.

"I've never heard the kids as quiet as they were today," Ruby said after the hour-long show. "It's a part of history that we very often forget to teach, but the kids love it. It's like Halloween, only better."

School Board member Allison Janss said the Middle Ages study has promoted extra reading and learning in Bliss. The local Parent Teacher Organization, she said, has raised funds to donate history and other books for every student to keep.

Serina Vodraska of Twin Falls said the Society for Creative Anachronism is a nonprofit organization with more than 60,000 chapters worldwide, including ones in Twin Falls, Mountain Home and Boise. Members study medieval times - the years 600 to 1600, she said. They dress in authentic clothes of the time, reenact the lifestyles and engage in simulated combat with weapon replicas. Their goal is to share their knowledge with the general public.

"It's kind of a hobby for us," Vodraska said. "We read a lot of books."

At dinner in their castles, noblemen sat at the head of a long table, Vodraska said. Next sat dignitaries and honored guests, with the less important people seated at the lower end. A fire pit at the middle of the table burned all day. High above, deer and other game hung from the ceiling in the smoke.

At dinner time, smoked meat would be served in the fire, and chunks of it were cut by the pages and passed along the table on knife tips. Bards and storytellers would sit around the fire to entertain as the people ate.

Tablecloths at the noblemen's end of the table reached the floor, Vodraska said, because it was embarrassing to have feet or knees showing. Women's dresses also reached the floor so their feet would not be exposed.

Dinner at a castle typically was a three-course meal of meat, then fish, then potato and carrot stew, sometimes with a pastry for dessert. Ferrets were common pets, because

Snowpack sees slight dip below average in February

TWIN FALLS - February was a dry month - and only southern Idaho's mountain snowpacks have dipped below the longtime average.

"Most of the snowpack has dropped about 20 percent," said Peter Palmer, snow survey supervisor for the U.S. Natural Resources Conservation Service in Boise.

February was the driest month this winter in southern Idaho, Palmer said. Northern Idaho received above-average precipitation in February, he added.

Southern Idaho's mountain snowpacks did not melt appreciably during February, Palmer said, but they didn't grow much, either. The upshot is that snowpack levels are smaller than the 30-year average for early March.

March is typically the final month for winter snow accumulation, Palmer said, noting that snowpacks are usually largest around April 1.

The snow-accumulation season could stretch longer if April is wet and cold.

Tributary basins on the south side of the Snake River were hardest hit by February's miserly precipitation - only 39 percent of average. The Wood and Lost river basins got 65 percent of average February precipitation, while the Snake River basin upstream of Palisades Reservoir received 66 percent of average February precipitation.

While the news isn't good for Idaho water users, the overall water forecast still isn't bad, he said.

"Things slipped a little," Palmer said, "but I will not say that March will make or break us. We'll make it OK, regardless of what happens in March."

"I don't see any major cause for alarm," he added. "We're a heck of a lot better off than we were at this time last year, in terms of snowpack."

Overall, mountain snowpacks at the end of February stood at:

- 22 percent above average in the Henrys Fork drainage.
- 15 percent above average in the Little Wood River basin.
- 9 percent above in the Big Wood River drainage.
- 7 percent above in the Big Lost River basin.
- 2 percent above in the Little Lost River drainage.
- 8 percent below average in the Snake River basin upstream of Palisades Reservoir.
- 8 percent below average in the Salmon Falls Creek basin.
- 23 percent below in tributary basins for the Oakley Reservoir.
- 14 percent below average in the Owyhee River drainage.
- 10 percent below in the Bruneau and Jarbidge river basins.
- 3 percent below average in the Payette River drainage.

Snake River not considered a major source for salmon, official says

TWIN FALLS - Uncle Sam has shifted his attention away from the Upper Snake River as a primary source of water to save Idaho's endangered salmon, the region's top Bureau of Reclamation official said Thursday.

Federal fisheries managers are calling for only 427,000 acre-feet of water from the Upper Snake this spring - about three million more from the Upper Columbia River basin, said John Keys, the bureau's regional director in Boise. An acre-foot equals 325,850 gallons - enough to cover an acre with a foot of water.

Long-awaited plans released earlier this week by the National Marine Fisheries

Service spell out how federal reservoirs on the Snake and Columbia rivers will be operated to enhance salmon protection.

The 427,000 acre-feet sought from the Upper Snake "is a figure that's workable, and it's one that we've talked about with the state of Idaho," Keys said in a telephone interview. "It's something that's doable without any great harm."

"We have delivered that amount in three out of the last four years."

The bureau has until 1998 to firm up its commitments for Idaho water, Keys said. Contrary to earlier federal plans, the 427,000 acre-foot target will not increase.

To meet that goal, the bureau is planning to dedicate 95,000 acre-feet of uncontracted storage space in Cascade and Deadwood

reservoirs on the Payette and Deadwood rivers for salmon protection.

The bureau already has purchased 6,500 acre-feet of Snake River water from the Salmon River Canal Co., and is poised to complete the purchase of 16,000 acre-feet from the Canyonview Irrigation District, Keys said.

The purchases will "take some marginal cropland out of production," he said, adding: "It'll be challenged."

"There are people who feel that no matter how little we buy will cause harm to existing water rights," Keys said. The bureau must win approval from the Idaho Water Resources Board - and the state Legislature - to transfer more than 5,000 acre-feet out of state.

Even though the bureau has pledged to

purchase water from willing sellers, some legislators - including Gov. Phil Batt and House Majority Leader Bruce Newcomb, R-Burley - have vowed to fight any out-of-state transfers.

Idaho rivers and streams carry about 75 million acre-feet of water flows out of the state every year, said Jerry Hughes, Idaho district chief for the U.S. Geological Survey.

Under the NMFS plan, the Upper Columbia River basin will bear much more of the burden for salmon protection than the Upper Snake, Keys said.

Hydroelectric dams on the Columbia will be required to store more water - and generate less power - during winter months.

"It is only one position, it's an administrative position with quite a bit of money behind it, in an agency with a \$12 million budget," Bell said, suggesting the cut wouldn't hobble veteran services.

But veterans insist the position is too important to lose.

Bermeseolo oversees the state's three veterans' homes - and fills in for the homes' supervisors when they're absent. Supporters say Bermeseolo took a deficit-ridden program and put it on solid financial ground. They predict veterans' homes in Boise, Pocatello, and Lewiston will suffer if his job is eliminated.

Randall E. Russell, a veteran from Twin Falls, said he traveled to Boise to back Bermeseolo - and the state's veterans' services program. "We're worried that without this position, we're in deep trouble," Russell added.

Twin Falls resident Dorothy Warren, auxiliary commander for the Disabled American Veterans, said she traveled 130 miles to back Gary. "He's done a tremendous job," Warren said. Dorothy Warren's husband, William, lived in the Boise home for four years, and Dorothy saw Bermeseolo's commitment to veterans affairs first-hand.

"He's got an interest in the people," she said.

More than 100 veterans - bearing American flags and anti-JFAC banners - protested quietly while lawmakers met in the capitol. Thursday afternoon, JFAC co-chair Atwell Parry, R-Melba, and five other legislators met with veterans and Bermeseolo.

Afterward, Parry said JFAC may reconsider early next week. "I can't speak for JFAC, but my gut feeling is it's about 50-50 on whether to restore his job," he said.

Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, a JFAC member who voted to keep Bermeseolo's position, said the committee moved too quickly before cutting funding.

And Rep. Doc Lucas, R-Moscow, said he's impressed by what he has heard from veterans. He said he'd vote to reconsider, the matter.

Amy Kleiner, spokeswoman for Gov. Phil Batt, said the governor is glad that compromise is being considered. She said Batt was out of the loop on the issue - and was surprised by JFAC's Feb. 23 decision.

Basketball game will raise money for man's operation

BURLEY — Local radio stations and Kmart will team up in a basketball game against the Idaho State Police tonight to help raise money for Joe Wilson's \$30,000 pancreas transplant.

The game starts at 7:30 p.m. at the Mitico High School. Wilson, 33, has been a diabetic for 23 years. His kidneys are functioning at 13 percent, and insurance will cover costs for a new kidney. But insurance won't cover the cost of a new pancreas, because a pancreas transplant is a procedure that has been done only within the last five years, Wilson said. A new pancreas would bring Wilson's blood sugar back to normal, essentially curing him of his diabetes and stopping it before it ruined his heart. A doctor suggested doing both surgeries at once.

"We might as well do both and give you a really good chance on life," Wilson said, repeating the doctor's words.

Sticking around to raise his three sons ages 8, 5 and 3, has given Wilson a strong will to fight, he said.

Doctors have told Wilson he is a good transplant candidate, Wilson said. But a new pancreas isn't a financial possibility, Wilson said.

"Wilson goes on the waiting list for a new pancreas and kidney today, he said. He expects about a six-month wait.

So far, a six person committee has helped raise \$5,000 for Wilson, said Lloyd Taylor, a committee member.

An anonymous donor has guaranteed the \$7,000 down payment required for the transplant Taylor said.

Donations are tax deductible, he said. The committee has set up the Joe Wilson Charity Transplant Fund at First-Security-Bank in Burley and

Rupert, he said. People can donate cash and change into about 100 jars located throughout the Mini-Cassia area.

Judge refuses to decrease bond

BURLEY — A judge refused to reduce a \$200,000 bond to \$5,000 Thursday for a man charged with attempted murder, despite testimony by the accused's wife, mother and friend.

Kerry Moncur, 27, of Hazelton, has been charged with attempted murder in the shooting of Jonathan Dale Reed, 25, of Hansten, on Jan. 29 on Rock Creek Road.

Moncur is being held in the Mini-Cassia jail.

Though Reed's injury was not serious, 5th District Magistrate Nathan Higer said Moncur easily could be on trial for murder had the two bullets that hit Reed in the lower left rib cage been fatal shots.

Higer said although family support may be beneficial in making sure the incident doesn't happen again, there is no assurance that it won't.

"My concern is if authorities could be notified in time to avoid a

repeat of this incident," Higer said.

Moncur's wife, Leila, testified that she would notify authorities if she noticed the same warning signals that her husband displayed before the shooting.

"I think he was throwing everybody a red flag, including me, and we did nothing," she said.

Leila Moncur said she knew her husband had a drinking problem, but wasn't aware of a drug problem until a few months before she and Moncur were separated, she said. The drugs and alcohol led up to the separation, she testified.

The shooting took place during the separation, she said. According to an affidavit by Sgt. Dave Tracy of the Cassia County Sheriff's Department, Moncur believed Reed was seeing his wife.

Leila Moncur testified that she would take her husband of two and a half years back if he were out on bond. Moncur doesn't want drugs and alcohol in his life anymore, she said.

"I think the substance had a lot to

do with Kerry and his emotional (state). I think things were bad. I think he did a lot of soul searching (since the shooting). I don't think he would do it again. I don't think he can believe he even did it in the first place," Leila Moncur testified.

Moncur feels remorse over his actions and asked her to keep him informed how Reed was recovering, Leila Moncur said.

During cross examination by acting prosecuting attorney Alfred Barrus, Leila Moncur testified that her husband had displayed some violent actions toward her.

Glenn Conner, of Buhl, a partner from a construction company, testified that he had a position waiting to be filled by Moncur.

Barrus argued that there is no assurance that Moncur would not commit another offense.

"This case could easily be a murder case. Not only was it a serious crime, Moncur actually tracked down the victim," Barrus said.

Judge drops murder charge

BURLEY — A man charged with first-degree murder was released from jail Thursday after a prosecutor said he didn't have access to evidence and witnesses and that the defense attorney backed out of a plea agreement at the last minute.

Alfredo Romayor, 20, of Texas, was charged with the Sept. 2 shooting of Miguel Elizando-Salazar, 22, of Mexico, at the Cassia County Farm Labor Camp. Elizando-Salazar was killed by a gun shot wound to the neck.

Romayor's attorney James Anness denied Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Howard Smyser's statements that he didn't follow through on a plea agreement. Anness said there had been a misunderstanding.

Romayor and his sister Laura Canales, 29, plan to head home to Texas within the next few days, she said after Romayor was released Wednesday. Canales said she has lived in the area for seven months while her brother has been in jail.

"I'm the first one who knows he's out," she said smiling, noting that she will get in touch with the rest of the family in Texas.

Romayor said he did not shoot and kill Elizando-Salazar, and said he didn't think he would get out of jail.

"I thought I was going to court in March. But last night I dreamed that I went inside (the court room) and

the judge saw me and he said I was released," Romayor said.

"While in jail, Romayor said he thought about what life would be like in prison.

"A lot of things are in your mind. When I barely got here, they said you're in big trouble," he said.

As he was leaving with his sister, a guard waved good-bye and told Romayor he didn't want to see him around the jail any more.

Fifth District Judge George Grant Jr. granted Smyser's motion to dismiss the case, but Smyser may re-file the charges for a new trial.

Anness said he and Romayor have been telling police and the prosecution they know who killed Elizando-Salazar.

"This guy left within two hours of the shooting and went to Mexico. We believe he is now in Texas," Anness said.

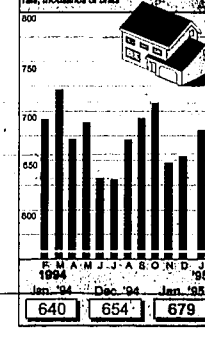

Shareholder claims Agee, other executives lied

BOISE — Another shareholder is suing former Morrison Knudsen Corp. Chairman William Agee and his top executives.

The lawsuit filed Tuesday in U.S. District Court in Boise names Agee, acting Chief Executive Officer Stephen Hanks, former Chief Financial Officer James Cleary and Morrison Knudsen itself.

The complaint from Michael Weiss, whose address was unavailable, alleges that shareholders were lied to about the Boise-based construction and engineering company's financial condition so Agee and the others could enhance the value of their own

shares and take advantage of executive perks. At least nine lawsuits now have been lodged against Agee and other MK officials since Feb. 1.

That was the day Morrison Knudsen announced it was facing a huge fourth-quarter loss, was in technical default on \$235 million in short-term loans and was eliminating its dividend to preserve cash.

MK spokesman Brent Brandon declined to comment on pending litigation. Weiss bought about 200 shares of MK stock in November 1993. He is suing on behalf of all shareholders who bought stock between Oct. 14, 1993, and Feb. 1,

Simms' talks with Browns end without deal; team holds out hope

The Cleveland Browns were all set to make the major announcement. A 4:30 p.m. news conference had been called, and more than 50 reporters and several television crews waited anxiously for the news. Only one problem. Phil Simms never showed up. The former New York Giants quarterback flew to Cleveland Thursday to presumably agree to a contract. But by the end of the day, there was no deal. Not to worry, the Browns explained. Simms will be in a Cleveland uniform this year. Just not right now. Simms and his agent, David Fishof, failed to reach a deal but both sides seemed hopeful that the matter can be resolved — perhaps within 48 hours. If not then, perhaps within a week or so. “We are working towards an agreement,” Fishof said. “That's why we have nothing to announce yet. ... But we'll work this thing out.” Browns director of personnel Mike Lombardi said he expects an agreement soon. “Phil made it very clear that he'd like to play in Cleveland,” Lombardi said. “When two parties want to get something done, they get it done. We didn't fully expect to get everything completed.” But the Browns expected enough to call a major news conference that was supposed to include Simms and Coach Bill Belichick. Instead, only Fishof and Lombardi addressed the assembled gathering. There are several factors holding up the deal, according to sources familiar with the negotiations. “The Browns are only about \$108,000 under the salary cap, meaning they would have to either waive other players or restructure other contracts to fit Simms' deal into the cap. Fishof wants to make sure Simms gets as much money as possible, and hinted that other teams were interested in Simms. Simms may not like how the contract offer was structured, because the Browns are believed to have inherited a low base salary and several incentives. Simms apparently wants more in base salary and/or a bigger signing bonus.”

Players show some skill

Hours before the game began, the Reds and Indians announced baseball's first two trades of replacement players. The Reds, who saw 23 of their 44 players leave camp rather than participate in games, got five guys, including former major leaguer Barbaro Garbey, all for future considerations.

A bad idea: The replacement Hall of Fame

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — Years from now, when they are working at real jobs with real futures, some of them will look back and wish there was such a thing as the Replacement Hall of Fame.

And some of them will look back and be thankful there isn't.

"I just hope nobody remembers this. That way," Yankees pitcher Brian Faw said, "I can just go ahead and make something up."

A moment later, that very thought caused Faw's ruddy complexion to brighten.

Though the 26-year-old right-hander played Double-A ball for the Yankees last year and technically is not a replacement player, he played like one Thursday. In one inning of work, the Dodgers torched Faw for four hits and five runs en route to an 11-3 pasting of New York.

But he was not about to dwell on those depressing numbers. Already, Faw was searching for another one he liked more.

"I'll say I struck out a couple," he said, then paused. "How about six?"

Make it seven, eight, 10, all 27 Los Angeles batters — make it any

number you like. For those who think spring training has already been ruined by the absence of real players and real umpires — and, to a degree, real fans — no number will make it better. And for those who have decided they can live with replacement players and such, well, a little replacement history is hardly going to bother them.

But something else will bother them. Until the start of the exhibition season, we tried to gauge the numbers on each side using polls. Now there are actual fanfics in the seats. And judging by how few were docked at Fort Lauderdale Stadium, Dodgers manager Tommy Lasorda and his side were troubled by the count.

"I'm very disappointed more fans didn't come out," he said, surveying nearly empty stands at game's end.

The crowd had been announced at 1,384, probably wasn't half that large and now was down to nothing. No kids hanging over the railings begging for autographs, no old-timers lingering to swap stories, no familiar faces to trade restaurant recommendations with.

"I think there's a misconception here, somewhere," Lasorda said. "I

was impressed with the way these guys played. It was a good game, not a sloppy game at all."

"It was," he said, growing more defensive by the moment, "mistake-less."

Even granting Tommy the replacement grammar the game was largely free of mistakes because the people who appeared on the field at one time or another played ball at the same level. Everything is relative.

Remember that the Dodgers' 40 best players and their dozen top minor league prospects are home right now. Same with the Yankees' 50 or so best. Now subtract those minor leaguers who have refused to take part in exhibition games because of the union's threat to treat them as pariahs in the future. What you have left is what each club could scare up on relatively short notice.

This is not an exaggeration. In order to be sure he could field a team, Dodgers executive vice president Fred Claire held a meeting Wednesday night in Vero Beach. He promised any minor leaguer who made the bus ride to Fort Lauderdale they would not face a pay cut.

That was on top of the offer of a \$5,000 bonus and a guaranteed job

somewhere in the organization he made a week ago.

"The remarkable thing about the way the players responded," Claire said with a more-or-less straight face, "is how it fell out by positions."

"We had catchers, infielders, speed guys, guys with power, the works. ... I don't know what we'd have done if we got 40 pitchers."

The Yankees had no such worries. They went out and loaded up on real replacement players, careful to get one for every position. It was a bonus that their real professionals were just as varied. They included caterer, sheriff, substitute teacher and real estate appraiser.

The men who hold those jobs expect to be back at them soon enough.

Faw, on the other hand, was one of the few Yankees appearing Thursday who still harbors legitimate hopes of becoming a major leaguer. But if it doesn't work out, he is prepared to be reunited with his teammates in the real world.

"The sooner I find out if I'm good enough to make it, the better off I am. That's why I decided to try it now."

"That way, if I can't do it, as a man, I can look myself in the mirror and know that this wasn't supposed to be my job."

Few warm seats for early games

Next up, maybe, replacement negotiators.

On a day when only 294 fans showed up to watch the Kansas City Royals open their exhibition season and Michael Jordan walked out of camp rather than play in spring training games, baseball strike talks seemed close to breaking down Thursday.

Colorado Rockies chairman Jerry McMorris, regarded as a deal-maker, said he thought he'd been "used" by union head Donald Fehr and his staff, and suggested that his side might need to bring in management hard-liners.

The talk elsewhere was about replacement ball. Five exhibition games, played by replacement players and officiated by replacement umpires, were played to better-than-expected reviews in Florida.

There even was a trade involving replacement players.

Attendance at the games was down. The Royals drew under 300 for a game against Stetson University in Gainesville, Fla., about 600 each saw the games between Los Angeles and the New York Yankees in Fort Lauderdale and Georgia Tech and Atlanta in West Palm Beach and 685 watched Minnesota play Pittsburgh in Bradenton.

"When the Braves were bad, this kind of crowd we'd get, with the stands half-empty," said Mort Mendelsohn of Jupiter, Fla.

Earlier, the Reds and Indians announced the first trades of replacement players.

Cleveland, which had stockpiled players and had a surplus, wound up sending five guys, including former major leaguer Barbaro Garbey, to the Reds for future considerations.

"Cleveland got the better of the deals," cracked Reds manager Davey Johnson. "They didn't get anybody."

Jordan, like many minor leaguers, was caught in the squeeze by the union and management. He elected to leave the Chicago White Sox camp in Sarasota, Fla., leaving his status for the rest of the spring uncertain.

Jordan jumped into his Range Rover and drove away. He said he'd have a statement on his situation later. His personal assistant and driver, George Koehler, said Jordan only told him: "We're going."

White Sox general manager Ron Schuler wasn't sure what to expect.

"I'd have to wait and see and address it. I don't know all the issues involved. I'm really not sure he's leaving town," Schuler said. "Let's wait until tomorrow morning and see if he shows up. As far as I know, he's not missing unless he's not here tomorrow morning."

In games Wednesday, the Twins beat Pittsburgh 6-4, helped by Cory Scafe's two-run triple off 36-year-old Jimmy Boudreau, son of Hall of Famer Lou Boudreau.

Boudreau has been out of pro ball since 1986. "He should have been better pitching on 3,195 days' rest," Pirates broadcaster Steve Blass said.

Kansas City defeated Stetson 3-1 by taking advantage of six walks from George Kauffman, grandson of late Royals founder Ewing Kauffman.

FILER — The New Seekers would "like to teach the world to sing." Larry Larson is just concentrating on Filer.

The Filer High School music instructor is teaching his students to sing and to play musical instruments, too. During March, "Music in our Schools Month," he's taking his Madrigals to the Statehouse in Boise and his choir to the district contest. He's also tuning up for a used instrument drive.

Five years ago, when Larson came to Filer, he had 71 kids in his bands and choirs. Now, he has 131.

And there are another 175 budding musicians in the Filer fifth-through eighth-grade bands, with the younger groups under the direction of instructor Melanie Halsell. That adds up to between 80 and 100 percent enrollment in beginning band.

"With this many kids, you have a lot of breakage," Larson said. "We also need instruments for special-needs kids, because a student shouldn't be told he can't participate because he has no horn."

Larson's been thinking about an instrument drive for a long time. This month, the Filer Music Boosters will get into the act.

With a strong booster club behind him, Larson hopes to collect 30 horns ("I'm a dreamer"). Actually, he needs anything — brass or woodwind, even elementary and rhythm band instruments.

"We'll take any instrument left to die in a closet somewhere," Larson said.

He plans to donate his time repairing the items. He already has the experience. He's been patching up horns for the past 17 years.

tions to pad the coffers. The kids will help with simple repairs, like re-heading drums.

It's the brass and woodwind work that's both time-consuming and intricate, Larson said.

He explained, "In a woodwind re-pad, you have to disassemble everything, replace the springs and corks, re-seat the pads and make sure they all match and you generally have to use levers and bars to pry."

Larson will also remove dents from trumpets and clean up the finished products.

"Sticky is not a big problem," he said.

Filer kids are already sharing the excitement. "I wanted to play flute in sixth grade," said 15-year-old Erid Shank, now a member of the Filer Madrigals show choir. "I might donate my flute."

Other Madrigals chimed in: "Can I donate my brother's trombone?"

Once the equipment is collected and repaired, it will be given to students who can't afford to buy instruments.

"We might have them earn their instruments," Larson said, "like by helping with chairs and stands or something."

Siberia's Little Eagles soar onto Twin Falls stage

TWIN FALLS — From the distant reaches of central Siberia comes an ensemble of young musicians who are out to rekindle the faith in music and youth.

The Little Eagles of Siberia was founded in 1971 by Ludmilla Stebenkova, who's still the group's director. Group members range in age from 12 to 19. Many of them speak English. All of them are learning.

Thirty-three Little Eagles will be soaring into the Magic Valley.

So far, the group has toured in Canada, Poland, Romania, the Czech Republic, Bulgaria and Mongolia, as well as throughout Russia and the United States. Consisting of both choral ensembles and instrumental groups, the young people perform everything from Glinka to Gershwin, from Borodin to the Beatles.

"You must audition to join the choir, and there are very high standards of performance," said Little Eagles tour manager Stephanie Conroy, a former member of the Ballet Company at Radio City Music Hall. "They practice three afternoons a week, three hours at a time."

This is a group of kids who are extremely self-disciplined, according to Conroy. Their tours last from eight to 13 weeks, even though they attend schools in their home, Krasnoyarsk, an industrial city of one million people.

"They have their school books, and they are good scholars," Conroy said. "If they were not, they would not be invited to come."

The young people earn their own way with concert fees. Sometimes, they work with corporate sponsors. One of these, a Siberian insurance company called Astrovar, paid for the costumes for this tour. Another, Avtotekhnika-Holding, a joint stock company, also contributed funds.

The Little Eagles stay in homes or hotels

on tour. Often, their surroundings are a form of culture shock.

Their homeland is 3,800 miles east of Moscow, halfway between Novosibirsk and Vladivostok on the Pacific coast, where the rugged mountains of Tibet touch

the harsh and bitter terrain of the Siberian plateau. The city of Krasnoyarsk ("red clay") was once a Cossack fort defending the junction of the rivers Yenisey and Kacha from invading Tartar hordes.

Boyz in the 'hood

The R&B sensation will play at the BSU Pavilion on Sunday

BOISE — They're not in Hammer territory yet, but rhythm in blues stars Boyz II Men are definitely a hot ticket headed into their Sunday night concert at the Boise State University Pavilion.

"We won't sell out because we'll just keep moving the stage back (to accommodate more people)," BSU ticket manager Phyllis Lyons said Thursday. "But with only a little more than 72 hours to go, we only have about 2,000 tickets left."

The Pavilion holds 12,000 spectators, but because of the way stages and lighting are configured, more typical capacity for concerts is between 9,500 and 10,000 seats.

M.C. Hammer, the California rapper who now goes by his last name, holds the all-time Pavilion box office record for a concert. He drew 24,000 people for back-to-back shows in 1989.

Boyz tickets are moving about as well.

"The real good seats are already gone," Lyons said. "Unless the promoter releases some of its seats behind the balcony."

Boyz, a clean-cut Philadelphia quartet, bolstered its box-office appeal Wednesday night in Los Angeles when it won the Grammy R&B album trophy for "II" and received the award for best R&B duo or group vocal performance for "I'll Make Love to You."

The group has sold 7 million records since its recording debut three years ago.

"We'll celebrate the way we always celebrate," singer Nathan Morris told Knight-Ridder News Service about the Grammys. "We'll say a prayer, drink some orange juice, and get back to work."

Line up for some ticket advice

So your favorite artist is finally coming to town, and you are dying to go to the show — you and 30,000 other people. How do you get a front-row seat — or at least avoid getting stuck in the rafters?

Well, these days, unless you're well-connected, it's pretty much a matter of chance. In days of yore, frans could show their devotion to an artist by camping out in fine — for days, if necessary — to ensure that they were front-row center the night of the show.

But some outlets began to discourage or forbid camping out, and the practice became less effective once services such as Ticketmaster and Ticketron began selling tickets by phone. Some of the best seats went to those at home with quick fingers or snazzy phones featuring speed-dial functions.

If you're determined to get good seats to a popular event, there are a few ways to increase your odds slightly at the ticket window or on the phone. Here are a few of the ins and outs of the system:

Q: How does that random-number system work?

A: The day tickets go on sale, everyone in line at a given ticket outlet will draw a number. Then a number will be selected at random (often, the outlet staff will ask a child or an uninvolved passer-by to pull a number from a hat). Say there are 100 people in line, and the number 65 is selected. The patron holding No. 65

gets to be first in line for tickets, followed by Nos. 66, 67, etc. The person holding No. 1 would have to follow No. 100.

Q: Is there any way to maximize my chances of getting a good seat, even with the random-number system?

A: Take friends along to the outlet to increase the chances of drawing a good number and getting a prime spot in line.

And know your outlets. If you haven't been to an outlet in a while, make sure it's still open — locations do change. Try to patronize one where there are at least two well-trained employees concentrating on ticket sales — one punching up seats on the computer, one processing money. If a solitary poor-behaved clerk is simultaneously processing ticket orders and ringing up sneakers or magazines, or if clerks are new at the game and get confused, you could wind up with lousy seats because tickets at other outlets have been moving more quickly. A few seconds can make a big difference in seat location.

Sit by yourself. There may be one good seat left up in front. Conversely, don't try to sit with your seven best friends — it may be difficult to get a block of eight seats in a good location.

Of course, it's essential to know when tickets are going on sale. Radio and television ads can alert you to bigger events, and college stations include many club events on their concert calendars.

Q: I was the first in line at the ticket window but still got seats 20 rows back. How come?

A: Could be a large block of tickets was held. Or sometimes rows are released in scrambled order — Row 6 might be sold before Row 5, for instance.

Q: What if I don't have time to stand in line at a ticket outlet?

A: The service charge will be a little higher, but you can always use your credit card to order by phone — provided you can get through. It helps to have speed dial, of course. You can have your friends dialing too to increase the odds although you might wind up with extra tickets if more than one of you gets through about the same time.

Sometimes you can call long distance to Ticketmaster in another city to order tickets for a show in your own city. Because fewer people in that city will be buying tickets for your show, you might have more success. But Ticketmaster is onto this and sometimes will block telephone sales from other cities for a certain period of time — say, if the show is sold out by the time I get through to Ticketmaster or I get up to the window, and all there have left are crummy seats at the very back of the very top of the arena or stadium?

A: You could go through a licensed ticket broker, an agency that buys and resells tickets. But expect to pay top dollar for seats — sometimes hundreds of dollars above face value. The price, of course, depends on the popularity

of the event. Ticket brokers advertise in newspaper classifieds and Yellow Pages.

Q: What if I showed up till the last minute, the show is sold out, and I can't afford to buy some fancy ticket package from a broker?

A: Even if the show was designated a sellout, the box office may release tickets originally held back. Also, sometimes tickets are dumped back into the system because someone canceled their telephone credit card order before the tickets were mailed. Or the venue may discover room for additional seats after the stage is set up. Tickets could be released at any time, but it usually seems to occur a few hours before showtime. You can't count on last-minute tickets becoming available, but then again, you could luck into better tickets than you might have gotten the day they went on sale.

In addition, there are often people wandering around the vicinity

of a venue the night of the show with tickets to sell. Some of these are folks just looking to get face value (or even less) for tickets they find they can't use. Others are scalpers looking to make a big profit.

Remember, the closer to show or game time, the cheaper the seats will be. If you hold out until the last minute, scalpers who overbought may be anxious to unload tickets.

Q: Those service charges seem too high to me. Sometimes they raise the cost of a ticket more than 25 percent. Is there any way around them?

A: For some events, it is possible to avoid a service charge by buying tickets at the venue or through the sponsoring organization. For instance, there is no service charge on tickets purchased at the box office of many arenas.

Q: Why doesn't somebody do

something about high service charges?

A: There have been a number of class-action suits against Ticketmaster around the country, but so far, nothing has come of that. A few artists also have tried to protest Ticketmaster fees. Mega-selling rock band Pearl Jam ended up canceling its last scheduled tour rather than use Ticketmaster. It circumvented Ticketmaster for a pair of benefits in Washington, D.C., by using a mail-order lottery system. The band is now scouting for venues not tied exclusively to Ticketmaster for its 1995 tour.

The hot young band Green Day, on the other hand, worked a deal with Ticketmaster in order to keep service fees and ticket prices lower on its last tour. And the Grateful Dead for years has sold tickets via mail order to Richard Deadheads who follow the band around the country.

Grammys should really be the Shammies

The best album of 1994 was "MTV Unplugged" by Tony Bennett.

Repeat it over and over until the words stop sticking in your throat.

Easy. It may take time.

"I don't believe this. I really don't believe it," Bennett said in accepting the Grammy Award for album of the year.

He's not alone.

According to the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, that album is better than anything by Pearl Jam, Nirvana, Green Day, Neil Young, the Offspring, Liz Phair, Hole, R.E.M., nine inch nails, you name it.

And a slight piece of Sheryl Crow fluff called "All I Wanna Do" is the record of the year.

C'mon — even Crow outdid that song with "Leaving Las Vegas," another cut from her "Tuesday Night Music Club" album.

Crow also won for best new

artist, properly acing Ace of Base. But Crash Test Dummies and Counting Crows were more credible picks. And when you look back at 1994, Green Day will be the band that showed where music was going in the mid-'90s.

Despite a run sweep by Bruce Springsteen, the Grammys turned out to be a bigger embarrassment than usual this year. Critical favorites Pearl Jam and Counting Crows didn't win a single award.

Springsteen's "Streets of Philadelphia" is certainly a wor-

thy winner, considering the competition.

But it's somewhat disheartening. After more than 20 years of writing genuinely touching, personal songs, he makes his biggest Grammy splash as a hired tunesmith with a written-to-order, often-bland ballad composed for a calculated good-guys-vs.-bad-guys Hollywood tear-jerker.

PLAYING SAFE: As usual, it was a night for safe, tame picks. Aerosmith won for best rock group performance, beating Counting Crows, Green Day, Nirvana and Pearl Jam — all of whom

were in grade school when Aerosmith first formed. The Rolling Stones similarly won for best rock album with "Voodoo Lounge," beating R.E.M., Pearl Jam, Soundgarden and Neil Young.

BEST MOMENT: A stunning performance by Seal of "I'm Alive," which probably made many Grammy voters wish they'd actually listened to his album a bit more before rejecting it for album of the year.

MOST SURPRISING PERFORMANCE: The Rolling Band. The often-pretentious former lead singer of Black Flag put across a very sarcastic version of "Liar" that was the most forceful bit of music of the evening.

SOME GOOD CHOICES: In all fairness, in some cases the Grammys got it right. Bob Dylan won best traditional folk album for his brilliant "World Gone Wrong." Al Green and Lyle Lovett beat the smarmy likes of Bryan Adams, Mariah Carey and Bennett for best pop vocal collaboration.

The kids work hard to teach people about their culture, and to spread goodwill wherever they go.

The first half of a Charlie Eagles concert is formal and frequently liturgical, filled with classics from both Russia and the United States. The second half of the concert consists of popular English tunes and Russian folk songs.

"These children love to sing," Conroy said. "Last month, on tour, they celebrated Army Day (a Feb. 22 holiday in Siberia), with the girls cooking up a performance for the boys after a show."

Conroy said kids love to swim in hotels, and the group once visited Universal Studios in Los Angeles. (Maki-culture shock?)

When asked about the kids' opinion of American food, Conroy was diplomatic.

"Mostly they like American food," she said, "but they still love their bowl of Russian soup with bread."

Morrissey, Belly and John Lee offer up new releases

Belly, "King" (Sire/Reprise). The problems that rendered Belly's gold debut "Star" less than perfect are in evidence again on this follow-up. Although it shows growth in ambition, the album offers little of the catchy pop of such earlier singles as "Feed the Tree."

Leader Tanya Donelly's arty-abilities sometimes outstrip her afflictions as a tunesmith. For such a reputed pop goddess, the former Throwing Muses singer, Eriqer writes underdeveloped songs. "Red" is sung from an interesting viewpoint — that of an older woman facing the imminent death of a son, presumably from AIDS — but its irritating vocal hook detracts from the drama.

Still, when she stops the high-

pitched, aimless wailing, Donelly is capable of some of the sexiest singing in current pop. The sensual imagery of lyrics like those of the title track and "Unlited and Unsung" momentarily lift the record. But there aren't enough of those seconds of pleasure to keep "King" on hook very long.

John Lee Hooker, "Chill Out" (Pointblank). John Lee Hooker is apparently so secure in his musical direction that he'll give anything a shot. On "Chill Out" (Things Gonna Change), the first cut of this album, he reunites with fan Carlos Santana, lending his gruff throatiness to a Latin-lite groove led by some antiseptic Santana guitar. The result, reminiscent of the Hooker/Santana collaboration on the former's 1989 comeback effort "The Healer," is such a weird piece of music

that it's hard to even get mad at it.

Fortunately, Van Morrison, who shows up a few tracks later, doesn't take advantage of the star's deference to his guests. Morrison allows the elder statesman to set the pace on a six-minute medley of "Serves Me Right to Suffer" and "Syndicator" before, to Hooker's obvious pleasure, torching the songs.

Otherwise, Hooker is often all but on his own here, engaging in solo and small-group renditions of both old and new numbers. The teen romance of "Too Young" is given further poignance by the 75-year-old bluesman's reading. And if the laconic urgency of "Tupelo" and "Woman on My Mind" is stuff Hooker can deliver in his sleep, well, let him dream on.

Morrissey, "World of Morrissey"

(Sire/Reprise). Young Steve Morrissey's new collection of singles A's & B's and live tracks is both enjoyable and frustrating. It's good to hear the self-mocking "Sister I'm a Poet," Morrissey's rewrite of "Moon River" and the current UK 45 "Boxers" all in one handy package. There's also "Have-Go Merchants," reportedly a slap at Natalie Merchant's botched cover of "Everyday Is Like Sunday."

But where the similar collection "Bona Drag" (1990) duplicated only one song from the solo album that preceded it, the 14 tracks on "World" include four tracks from "Your Arsenal" and "Waxstain and I" and an in-concert take of a fifth. And marvelous as "The Last of the Famous International Playboys" is, it's already widely available — on "Bona Drag."

Years of work give singer something to Crow about

In "Can't Cry Anymore," a song from her album "Tuesday Night Music Club," one of Sheryl Crow's many talented, down-and-out characters offered this resigned observation: "Could've been worse/Could've missed my calling."

She didn't. Crow has been performing and writing music almost all of her life, and the October 1993 release of "Tuesday Night Music Club" made good on years of studying and teaching music, singing commercial jingles, doing backup vocals and writing songs for others.

The past six months in particular, ever since her performance at Woodstock '94, Crow's star has soared. "All I Wanna Do," her wozzy ode to good times, was one of the most played radio hits of the year. Now the new "Strong Enough," at No. 12 on the Billboard charts, is vying for the same success.

"Tuesday Night Music Club" has sold three million copies, most of them since last August — and her record company, A&M, expects to sell another million following her performance at the Grammy Awards Wednesday night in Los Angeles. The album is still on the Billboard Top 20, and on her first bona fide headlining tour, Crow is drawing full houses despite her plethora of appearances as a supporting act.

Besides Woodstock, Crow was part of last summer's H.O.R.D.E. tour. She opened for Bob Dylan and the Eagles, and she performed "Live With Me" with the Rolling Stones in a worldwide pay-per-view broadcast last November.

And when Crow settles into her seat at the Grammys in Los Angeles, her five nominations will cap her ascent. Whether she wins or loses doesn't matter — though the smart money is on Crow in the Best New Artist category.

The fact that she got so many nominations, along with stalwarts Bruce Springsteen, Elton John and Bonnie Raitt, shows that Crow has become one of pop's hot newcomers and an established talent.

'NBA JAM T.E.' takes game to the next level

"I don't know — I'm less surprised about it than most people," says Crow, 33. "It feels to me like we've really worked. The album's been out a long time, and we've been out playing almost all that time. It's been a logical sort of uphill climb."

Neither Crow nor her record company expected much from "All I Wanna Do" — certainly not that it would be the song to put her over the top.

"Everyone thought it was a throw-away," says Crow, who adapted the song from a poem called "Fun" by Vermont college instructor Wyn Cooper. "It wasn't even considered as a single for me. My little brother said, 'All I Wanna Do' is the best song on the record." "I kept saying 'No way!'"

Now, thanks in a large part to that song, Crow's little brother and a good friend of the rest of her family — she's the third of four children — will join her at the Grammy ceremony.

"They're all flying out — even my 82-year-old grandma who's never been on an airplane," says Crow. "In that way it's precious. It's really a big deal for them."

"For me, I'm not sure. I know too much about it, I guess. I don't know that those kinds of awards validate you personally."

"You know what? Honestly, I feel relatively unaffected by all this. Maybe I'm in a psychological denial, but I feel like we've sort of kept our nose to the grindstone, and that's kept me grounded. I've enjoy the process, watching the audiences grow. But I don't have a lot of time to reflect on it, either."

"Plus," she adds with a laugh, "I'm not 21 years old. If this was happening to me then, I might have lost my head. Now I can appreciate it as something I've worked a long time for."

Crow took her pursuit of music to the University of Missouri, where she studied theory and voice. She also fronted a rock band, Kashmir — named after the Led Zeppelin song — that played weekends at a bar named Bullwinkle's. She made extra money by coaching fraternities on their brotherhood songs.

Crow refers to herself as a "reluc-

tant" student often at odds with her instructors, but by theory professor Thomas McKenney says she was "a first-rate student. I'm talking about A-quality work. She had a very good musical ear ... and normally students who do well in those types of classes have at least the potential to be successful."

After graduating in 1984, Crow and her fiancé — another Kashmir member — moved to St. Louis, where she taught elementary school music for two years. But after her fiancé told her, "If you're not singing for the Lord, you shouldn't be singing," Crow decided to dump him and to keep singing. She worked on jingles with a local commercial producer and kept gigging with bands including one, P.M., that released an album on Warner Bros.

Crow finally decided the best way

to make it big was to move to Los Angeles, so she took the proceeds from a particularly lucrative McDonald's jingle, loaded her car and made the drive west — a rush-hour traffic jam.

Her career didn't exactly hit the fast lane, either. She spent more time writing than singing, sustaining herself with bags of trail mix. "In my first two years in L.A., I lived in seven different places," she remembers.

"I don't like to have too many friends," she says. "I change my phone number when there are too many people in my life. It's the abandonment theory. I don't want anybody to get too close because they might leave me."

She pauses and laughs. "I could be a great case study for somebody, couldn't I?"

Spending \$50 on music? Drop cash on these artists

Two stars in the escalating British rock revival — the Stone Roses and Portishead — earn places in this month's guide to keeping up with what's exciting in pop on a budget of \$50 a month. Not all the entries, however, are English. The domestic datelines range from Portland, Ore., to Philadelphia.

Pete Drobe, "Necktie Second" (American). The album's "Fourth of July" is a song about a lost soul that combines the poignant imagery of John Prine with the sweet innocence of Gram Parsons, a sign that the folk-accented rocker from Portland, Ore., has serious cult status potential. Other moments in this winning debut, however, offer the longing and detail of Tom Petty's early work, suggesting that Drobe may not always be a stranger to the charts.

Portishead, "Dummy" (Go! Discs/London). This restrained, lushly atmospheric music is so cinematic that parts of it seem like a traditional soundtrack. When Beth Gibbons' smoky vocals are added, the music conveys the feel of a night in a stylish '40s supper club. At the point those elements intersect, Portishead captures breathlessly the feeling of love that leaves you wounded and exhausted but never defeated.

The Stone Roses, "Second Coming" (DGC). Consider yourself lucky if you never heard the British band's celebrated 1989 debut. You can avoid the debate about whether this long-delayed

follow-up lives up to expectations — and just enjoy the album. John Squire's songs and bluesy guitar licks team with the soulful wonder of Ian Brown's vocals in frequently magical ways that recall classic rock elements, from Zeppelin to the Byrds, without sacrificing '90s independence.

The Ass Ponies, "Electric Rock Music" (A&M). Rock is populated by so many bands with exaggerated ambition that it's refreshing to find a group with nothing more weighty on its mind than taking us on an afternoon stroll around a small Midwestern town. Against a backdrop of roots-accented music that is compact yet relaxed, the Cincinnati quartet raises gentle questions and offers quiet truths amid deceptive simplicity. Oddly endearing.

The Roots, "Do You Want More?!!!!!!!" (DGC). Lots of groups have experimented with a fusion of hip-hop and jazz, but this Philadelphia outfit is the most assured. Rather than taking sampling shortcuts, the Roots concentrate on live music in a collection that may not reach out with the accessibility of Digable Planets but is consistently wry and warm.

Martin Zellar, "Born Under" (Rhino). In this glowing solo debut, the leader of the late, great Gar Daddies writes blue-collar tales about hard times and hard lessons that are reminiscent of the eloquence of the Blasters in their prime. The best of the tracks offer an engaging sense of one's struggle with demons, real and imagined.

Disney readies to set records, rake in dough with 'Lion King'

This week "The Lion King" will roar into the home video market with a powerful marketing message: "Available for a limited time only."

That message, a Walt Disney Co. staple, taps the most basic law of economics — when supply is limited, demand rises. And few doubt that "The Lion King," which reignited at the box office in 1994, will become king of video cassettes this year.

The company has proved time and again that the best way to market videos of its top films is to limit sales to a set period — say six months to a year.

"It's very smart and very crafty," said David Davis, a motion-picture analyst with the California consulting firm Paul Kagan Associates Inc.

The idea is to put pressure on shoppers to buy sooner rather than later. By limiting the video's shelf life, Disney also enhances the perceived value of the product as a collectible.

"So why doesn't every studio do it? The other companies can't get away with it," said Harold Vogel, an entertainment securities analyst with Cowen & Co. in New York. "They don't have evergreen films."

Regardless of whether "The Lion King" proves to be an evergreen, no one disputes its status as a contemporary mega-hit. "I challenge you to find any 3-year-old who not only doesn't know 'The Lion King' but doesn't know at least five of the songs by heart," Davis said.

If history is any guide, even some of the more jaded consumers will flock to stores this week, when some retailers begin selling the video, to make sure they've got Simba and company in their collection before sales cease.

Many aren't even waiting for the video's release, having already reserved copies through pre-purchase orders.

The drum roll for the video's debut began weeks ago, with advertising for children, rebates and other promotional gimmicks for moms and dads. Large retailers such as Toys 'R Us, Target and Best Buy say they'll start selling tapes early this week, and the video will be widely available by Friday.

Most expect big sales. The rush-to-buy mentality, and the selling techniques behind it, are as old as retail itself. But it's something at which Walt Disney Co. excels.

Consider the following: "The Lion King" was the top-grossing film of 1994 and the most successful movie in Disney history. Company executives say it has earned \$720 million at the box office.

Sales of related merchandise approached \$1 billion last year, as Lion King clothes, cups and cuddly toys became some of the hottest-selling products.

Disney officials say the film's soundtrack was the No. 1 selling album of 1994, with 7 million U.S. copies sold.

While those statistics seem impressive, wait until "The Lion King" videos hit store shelves.

Disney Chairman and Chief Executive Michael Eisner said recently the company plans to ship about 27 million copies of the video. But Disney officials say that number represents only the initial sales goal for the domestic market. They say the video should be available in stores through Christmas, so shoppers shouldn't worry about supplies drying up.

Although Disney has "no international release date, it aims to sell an additional 14 million copies overseas."

Some analysts say U.S. sales of "The Lion King" video could approach 30 million copies. That would make it the best-selling video on record. Industry experts say Disney's "Snow White," released last year, is already close to surpassing another Disney feature, "Aladdin," as the No. 1 seller, with 24 million U.S. copies sold.

Pillsbury and Mattel hope to ride the popularity of "The Lion King" by offering rebates to shoppers who purchase their products along with the video. Toys 'R Us is offering a \$5 store credit to shoppers who pre-order the video at \$16.99. Numerous other companies plan similar promotions.

Whatever the final sales tally, "The Lion King" should rank among Disney's most profitable ventures this year. Vogel, of Cowen & Co., estimates the company earns \$9 to \$10 on every video cassette it sells, which makes them among the most profitable products in the world.

For consumers, those numbers are of little consequence. The real issue is where they will buy their copy. Though the suggested retail price is \$26.99, prices will vary widely.

You can bet some parents will buy the video wherever they see it first. "If you have a kid who likes 'The Lion King,'" Vogel said, "you'd better get it now." (Hastings, Blockbuster, Video West).

Blockbuster polls customers for its own awards

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — There are the Grammys, the Oscars, and the People's Choice Awards. Now get ready for the Blockbuster Entertainment Awards.

During March, Blockbuster will be polling customers for their favorite movies, movie stars, videos, video stars and musicians, and the results will appear on the televised Blockbuster Entertainment Awards, a two-hour special set for CBS on June 6.

The company says the 40 million people who visit a Blockbuster Music or Video store each month can vote electronically through March 31, and the results will be tabulated for the award ceremony.

But even though some of the awards could go to properties

launched by a sister company of Blockbuster's, Paramount Pictures, Blockbuster says it has taken steps to make the award ceremonies as objective as possible.

"We have no reason to favor any actor, despite being part of Viacom," said spokesman Michael Caruso, speaking of Blockbuster's parent, Viacom. "We're an entertainment company, we want to recognize what people want to see."

A spokeswoman said a "major accounting firm" will be hired to tally ballots, but it has not been chosen yet.

A Paramount film, "Forrest Gump," is nominated for Favorite Movie. But that's no surprise. "Forrest Gump" was nominated for 13 Academy Awards.

Harrison Ford of Paramount's "Clear and Present Danger" was nominated for Favorite

Actor in an Action-Adventure-Thriller.

But Paul Newman, appearing in Paramount's "Nobility's Fool," got an Oscar nomination, but not a Blockbuster nomination.

Since film and actor-nominees are based on dollar sales, low-brow comedian Jim Carrey did better than Woody Allen. Carrey's "The Mask" and "Ace Ventura, Pet Detective" were both nominated, while Woody Allen's critically praised but low-grossing films were shut out.

Film and actor-nominees come from the top-grossing films as reported by Baseline. The video nominees are selected from Blockbuster's top renting titles for the first six weeks after release. The music nominees come from the biggest sellers reported by SoundScan.

Networks resign selves to cable gaining ground

No matter how you slice it, the broadcast networks are losing ground to cable this season.

According to Nielsen figures for February, the Big Three networks are off roughly 10 percent compared to the same period in 1993. (Because of the Winter Olympics last year, the February '94 ratings make for an unfair comparison.)

While the broadcast networks are dropping, the basic cable networks are rising. Basic-cable ratings in February were up 16 percent compared to February 1993.

And cable's growth isn't limited to just last month. For the season-to-date, basic-cable networks are up 10 percent over last year. For the same period, the Big Three are off 8 percent.

According to Tim Brooks, senior vice president of research at cable's USA, there isn't one single event behind the cable ratings growth. Instead, he said, viewers are getting used to surfing the dial, and finding new things to watch.

CBS research maven David Poltrack attributes part of the network decline to the absence of baseball in the fall and the lack of a blockbuster miniseries or show during the sweeps.

However, while admitting cable has grown, Poltrack said network TV isn't in "a state of erosion." Poltrack believes the ratings will rise and fall based on the quality of programming each has to offer.

'King George': Maddeningly good movie

As his royal minions and anxious family suspect, King George III may be going batty.

He's singing along off-key when the court orchestra plays Handel. He's openly lusty after the favorite lady-in-waiting of his devoted wife (and mother of his 15 children), Queen Charlotte. He's racing around the castle in his night-shirt, howling at the top of his royal lungs.

And he can't get into his head that those colonies across the Atlantic won't be his.

Yes, His Majesty could very well be bonkers. But as the deliciously clever and engrossing film "The Madness of King George" suggests, who on earth can tell a sane king from a liege who's wacko?

As one of several dubious medical men called in to minister to his ravaging English majesty observes,

the entire business of the monarchy is intrinsically crazy-making anyway.

That's a point that's richly embellished in Alan Bennett's sly and witty film script, based on his hit West End play, "The Madness of King George III."

And considering the travails and eccentricities of Britain's present royal family, it may hold true today.

Leading English stage director Nicholas Hytner makes a very impressive film debut here, fashioning a nimble, picturesque, at times unexpectedly poignant cavort through a narrow palace corridor of British history.

Scholars have suggested that he and Bennett play a little fast and loose with the facts of the period (1788) — fudging, for example, the political power struggles going on behind the king's back between

Prime Minister William Pitt (the unflappable Julian Wadham) and his chief rival, Charles James Fox (Jim Carter).

But if the filmmakers take dramatic license, they use it well.

And the jewel in their crown is Nigel Hawthorne's brilliantly mercurial performance as George III. A veteran character actor, best-known for his role in the BBC comedy series "Yes, Minister," Hawthorne makes the utmost of his first starring film role.

Whether he's George the imperious ruler, hexing an underling with the royal evil eye, or George the infantile psycho cowering in terror, or George the dreamy convalescent glorying in a passage from Shakespeare ("King Lear," of course), Hawthorne is never short of sublimity.

Hovering over him is a large supporting cast of equal caliber, got up in the ludicrous puffed steel-wool wigs and flouncy finery that were all the rage in 18th-century

England, and photographed by Andrew Dunn in atmospheric surroundings.

Helen Mirren makes Queen Charlotte a steely rose who reacts to her husband's unraveling with tenderness, horror and haughty rage. Amanda Donohoe as the sexy Lady Pembroke, Rupert Graves as a dashing royal attendant, and Rupert Everett as the puffy, conniving Prince of Wales also excel.

A amusing, too, (and horrifying) are the gaggle of quacks with primitive notions of mental health treatment. The most persistent is Dr. Willis, a sort of hypnotist/behavior modification expert, essayed with withering severity by Ian Holm.

Historians now believe George III's bizarre symptoms (which came and went, until his 1820 death) arose from porphyria, a metabolic imbalance. Whatever their origin, they've inspired a marvelous film. (Mall Cinema)

Seek out Goldblum as 'Hideway' reaches area

"Hideway" — Director Brett Leonard metamorphoses Stephen King ("Lawnmower Man") to Dean R. Koontz in this thriller only to be continually and terrifyingly linked to a psychotic killer. Jeff Goldblum and Christine Lahti star. (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

"Billy Madison" — Adam Sandler has the unfortunate habit as a comic of thinking he's funnier than he is. In this jerky comedy about a scion who has to repeat grade school and high school in order to inherit the family business. (PG-13, for language and crude humor.) (Motor-Vu Drive)

"The Brady Bunch Movie" — Is anyone surprised that this unquashable TV sitcom family has finally made it to the big screen? The conceit, transplanting the utopian Bradys to today's dystopian Los Angeles, is a crummy one, and the results are successfully silly. (PG-13, racy innuendos.) (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

"Dumb and Dumber" — Jim Carrey and Jeff Daniels star as a pair of low-wattage buddies. The film abounds in potty jokes and gross-out gags, but the real joke is that grown men are actually doing this stuff. (PG-13, for off-color humor. Times guidelines: lots of bathroom humor scenes.) (Shoshone Showhouse)

"Forrest Gump" — Director Robert Zemeckis uses the story of a holy fool whose IQ of 75 doesn't stop him from succeeding in life as a way to examine the turbulent recent decades of American history through a genially cracked

lens. (PG-13, for some drug content, sensuality and war violence.) (Twin Cinema)

"Heavyweights" — Lousy Disney comedy for pre-teens about a summer camp for fat kids. Ben Stiller plays the fitness guru who takes over the camp. Some scenes should have taken over the movie. (PG.) (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

"I.Q." — This overly contrived romantic comedy has one good idea: to cast Walter Matthau as Albert Einstein. But the outlandish and often appallingly underhanded contortions he and some genius pal go through to play cupid to Einstein's pretty niece (Meg Ryan) and a likable auto mechanic (Tim Robbins) are frequently uninspired and unfunny. (PG, for some mild language.) (Liberty Theater of Hailey)

"Just Cause" — Sean Connery is miscast as an unworried Harvard law prof in this clunky murder mystery/thriller set mostly in the Everglades. Laurence Fishburne plays a sadistic cop — though his role is about as incomprehensible as everything else in this botch. Call it "Cape Dull" — or maybe "Silence of the Crocodiles." (R, for strong violence and language.) (Century Cinema of Burley)

"Legends of the Fall" — Starring Brad Pitt in a glamorous star turn as one of three brothers in love with the same woman, well played by Julia Ormond, this lumbering epic makes an easy target, but director Edward Zwick has infused it with so much glossy watchability it is difficult to pull the trigger. (R, for violence and some sexuality and language.) (Twin Cinema)

"Murder in the First" — A film that believes that anything worth doing is worth overdoing. A prison picture set in Alcatraz in 1938, it stars Kevin Bacon as a convict who goes a little psycho in solitary confinement, Gary Oldman as the

sadistic warden who likes to keep him that way and Christian Slater as the cringing attorney who wants to save the world. (R, strong images of prison brutality, sexuality and language.) (Liberty Theater of Hailey)

"Nell" — A young woman (Jodie Foster) is found in a remote North Carolina cabin, speaking her own language and a total mystery to a pair of doctors with competing philosophies (Liam Neeson and Natasha Richardson) who try to figure out what is to be done with her. The creators of this hokey film have a similar difficulty trying to figure out what to do with Foster's remarkable performance. (PG-13, for nudity.) (Ace Theatre of Wendell)

"Nobody's Fool" — Paul Newman gives one of his most accomplished performances, infusing the role of an aging, Irish scamp with the easy enthusiasm and sense of the new usually associated with the young and the restless. Written and directed by Robert Benton and based on a novel by Richard Russo, this meandering film is pleasant enough, but aside from Newman his story of family reconciliation is on the thin side. (R, for some language and nudity.) (Twin Cinema, The Movie House of Ketchum)

"Pulp Fiction" — Despite strong writing and a revived performance from John Travolta, the Quentin Tarantino film's attempts to shock can feel strained and its self-referential quality can be tedious. (R, for strong graphic violence, drug use, pervasive strong language, sexuality.) (Jerome Cinema)

"The Quick and the Dead" — Welcome to Sergio Leone country, the delirious West where everything is excessive and self-parody is the norm. As the female Clint Eastwood, Sharon Stone proves she can star down a dunce with the best of them. Directed by the energetically cartoonish Sam Raimi, and it inevitably runs out of energy before anyone runs out of bullets. (R, Western violence.) (Ace Theatre of Wendell)

Film needs 'House' improvement

Disney's publicity campaign for "Man of the House" probably says more about it should about the state of Chevy Chase's film career.

Newspaper ads depict the "Saturday Night Live" star-turned-movie actor-turned-failed talk-show host as a puppet on strings manipulated by Jonathan Taylor Thomas of TV's "Home Improvement." The kid's picture is twice the size of Chevy's.

Jonathan, the 13-year-old who also provided young Simba's voice in "The Lion King," clearly is the meal ticket of a formulaic, consistently mediocre comedy that nonetheless might make big money. The "Home Improvement" factor can't be taken lightly, as Tim Allen's "The Santa Clause" proved.

Chase, whose "Coneheads" and "Robbers" crash-landed at theaters last year, can hope to feed at the trough, and then later pretend that he carried Man of the House. Two more TV venerables, Farrah Fawcett ("Charlie's Angels") and George Wendt ("Cheers"), are the other principal cast members in a film with more small-

screen markings than some made-for-TV movies.

While watching "America's Most Wanted," 11-year-old Ben Archer (Thomas) says, he learned that you can squeeze a person's guts out by tying him up with wet raphide and then letting it dry. Nice sentiment, Disney. But you can achieve roughly the same effect by watching this film.

Young Ben is the son of Sandra (Fawcett), whose husband dumped her and left with his secretary-five years ago. As he tells it, "Eventually she started dating again, but they were all jerks."

Chase's character, prosecutor Jack Stunges, is supposed to change all that. Precious for marriage, he moves in with Sandra and tries to win over Ben as well. But the kid instead tries to run him off by insisting they join a YMCA Indian Guides program headed by affable Chet Bronski (Wendt). Jack's Indian name will be Squating Dog, which turns out to be an apt metaphor for this movie. (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

THE ACES ON BRIDGE

"I didn't want to waste time on this hand," mumbled South. "It virtually played itself."
"Perhaps you should have let go of the reins completely," added East. "It could never have done worse than this one and it might have stumbled on the right play."

Note North's use of the forcing North-South convention. His two-club inquiry brought both majors into play, but when South showed neither, North's jump to three spades promised five spades and four hearts and forced East to bid. A bid of two spades would have been non-forcing, promising the same distribution with less strength.

South took the opening heart lead and cashed two more hearts, hoping for a 3-3 split. When they didn't break, he tried the spades. They didn't break either. With one trick won, South had to take the club finesse. It lost and West took his high heart and started diamonds. The defense scored a heart, two diamonds, a club and a spade and the game went down.

How does South improve his chances at making game? After ruffing the heart queen (the card West was known not to hold), he should lead his spade 10, refusing to win West's jack. West continues in hearts, but South is safe. With no 5-1 spade break, South can win four spades, three hearts and two clubs, circling nine tricks for his game and rubber.





Viewers suffering from cabin fever this winter and searching for some adventure can now find it by simply pressing a button.

"There are actually more extreme sports in the spring, summer and fall than there are in the winter, with kayaking, and base-jumping, and rock-climbing, mountain-biking—it just goes on and on and on," Barnette says.

Bowen says she also believes this is true about nonwinter sports. "If anything, the snow limits people from doing as much as

they'd like to do in the mountains," she says.

Fortunately, all of the actors have had some outdoor sports experience, to help prepare them for the physical part of the acting job.

"I think we are all fairly good skiers," Bowen says of the cast. "We're all competent."

Brolin also says the practice each day helps their advance in capability.

"Anybody that's a skier knows that after the third day of skiing, you really start getting good, but that's the day you have to go home," he says. "Since we got here, ...we've been able to ski day after day. And it's amazing how good you can get if you just practice."

No matter what the ability of the cast, precautions are used to ensure safety.

"We take a lot of precautions because we do put these guys in situations where actors normally don't go," Barnette says. "We always have first aid and

we also have a helicopter available, and we always know where to go and what to do if there's ever a problem."

Recently, there have been other shows with similar content, such as "Search and Rescue." However, "Extreme" provides a fresh look at the risks involved in dangerous sports activities, while supplying an entertaining soap-opera-like look at the team members.

"If you were to describe this show, it's a 'Cliffhanger' meets 'Generation X,'" Barnette says.

The beautiful scenery combined with heart-stopping adventures and emotional dramas is a solution to the winter blues. Brolin thinks this show has the potential needed to survive.

"I haven't looked on to a pilot or a television idea yet, but I didn't think had a lot of good potential, good location or great people working with me," Brolin says. "I don't really believe in the 'series of dots' "

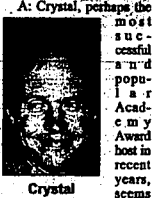

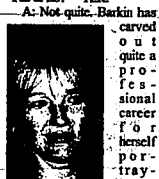
Q: You mentioned some time back that Michael Douglas was going to do a film with his dad. Any more news yet? —I.L.

Frustrated by a lack of good treatments for back pain, doctors are turning to a therapy they have long dismissed as chiropractic quackery: spinal manipulation. The American Association of Orthopedic Surgeons this year for the first time sponsored a symposium on back manipulation at its meeting and, in a show of hands, almost a third of the 1,000-member audience bashfully admitted that they had referred patients for the technique. "No question, manipulation is more accepted," said Dr. Scott Haskett, a neurologist who is also a chiropractor. 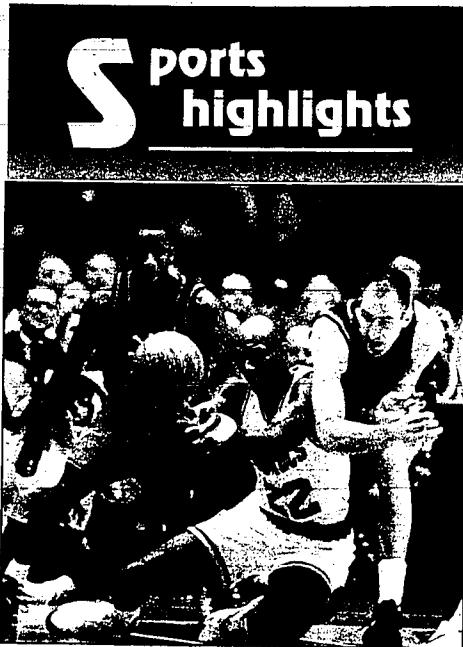

NBC peacock struts its stuff with potent shows

Guess who's back.
NBC.

The titan of 1980s television, following a ratings nose-dive after the decline of the Bill Cosby era, is suddenly setting off fireworks in the '90s.

No, it's not the No. 1 network. NBC is still on top, and Fox continues to progress. But what NBC has is the buzz. It's the talk of the industry and the hot network on Madison Avenue as it challenges ABC for the prime-time lead.

In the last two seasons, NBC has introduced a pair of powerful hits that have helped turn the network around. First came the comedy "Frasier" and then, last fall, "ER," a drama about a hospital emergency room that took off like a rocket and has been the top-rated show five of the last six weeks.

Not since "Charlie's Angels" in 1977 has a freshman drama managed the same five-week coup, according to NBC.

A bold stroke, typical of NBC's new aggressiveness, also came up roses when the network bet that ABC's "Roseanne" was ready to be taken.

NBC challenged "Roseanne" head-to-head with "Frasier" on Tuesdays. ABC blinked, moved "Roseanne" to another night, switched its franchise show, "Home Improvement," to checkmate "Frasier," and thus was forced to shake up two of its successful program blocks. "Looking back," says Joel Segal of the McCann-Erickson ad agency in New York, "the move of 'Frasier' to Tuesday was brilliant. It forced 'Home Improvement' to move. ABC realized 'Roseanne' would have died opposite 'Frasier.'"

That we'll never know for sure, because the switch gave "Roseanne," at least temporarily, a chance to continue as a winner against lesser competition on Wednesdays. However, after a lengthy run at 9 p.m., the series reportedly may be moved again, to 8 p.m.

As for NBC, its two big nights — Thursdays, with

"Seinfeld," "ER" and "Mad About You," and Tuesdays, with "Frasier," "Wings" and "The John Larroquette Show" — are not only carrying the network but defining it.

"It's quite obviously a network on the rebound," says Audrey Steele, research executive of the Saatchi & Saatchi ad agency in New York. "It's a strong growth story and a strong demographic story."

Although trailing ABC for the season by a narrow margin in total households, NBC has made tremendous strides in the 18-to-49-year-old category favored by advertisers.

"They went back to what worked in the past — adult, sophisticated comedy," says Steele. "I remember when they used to describe themselves to Madison Avenue with the phrase 'mass with class.'"

"Mad About You" was a great show from the beginning, but sometimes in television it takes time. Look at what 'Frasier' is doing against what was the No. 1 show on TV, 'Home Improvement.'"

While "Home Improvement" is still a powerhouse, "Frasier" has been more than holding its own against it. And a guest shot by former "Cheers" star Ted Danson last week helped "Frasier" come within one-tenth of a point of "Home Improvement" in the ratings.

ABC's audience, notes Steele, is different from NBC's — with its comedies generally emphasizing young families with children. NBC, she adds, goes more for adult viewers.

This NBC approach, often with a touch of quality carried over from the "Cheers" era, "is a great signal for broadcasters," says NBC Entertainment President Warren Littlefield. "It shows quality entertainment doesn't have to mean low

ratings."

NBC still has a far piece to go to match the day-in, day-out muscle with which it dominated network TV for six consecutive seasons starting in the '80s. On Sundays, for instance, two futuristic dramas, "Earth 2" and "seaQuest DSX," are struggling in total household ratings, but, according to NBC, are doing well with the 18-to-49 audience.

Nonetheless, says Segal, NBC is perceived on Madison Avenue as "comers, guys willing to take chances — and they are producing some of the best dramas on the air."

NBC got an added lift in its sweeps performance recently when, in addition to the Danson appearance on "Frasier," another drama in the six-hour miniseries "A Woman of Independent Means," starring Sally Field — pulled a respectable audience in its three nights, averaging a 16.6 rating and 25 percent of viewers.

CBS, in deep trouble with sponsors because of its older image, has fallen from No. 1 to third in households and is dead last, trailing even upstart Fox, with viewers 18-to-49.

But this season, NBC is where the action is.

Women today



Today 98 percent of all jobs in the armed forces are open to women.

Today, women serve in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard. They make up about 12 percent of the U.S. armed forces.

While they can't be in the infantry and can't serve in tanks or on submarines, they are serving in combat air squadrons and on Navy ships. About 98 percent of the jobs are open to them.



Women can also go to service academies such as West Point, Annapolis, the Air Force Academy and the Coast Guard Academy.

Revolutionary War



During the Revolutionary War, many women went off to war and served alongside their husbands.

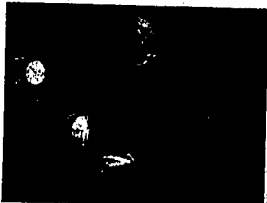
From the beginning of our nation's history, women have served with the military. About 20,000 women served with George Washington's army. They were paid half the salary and received half the food rations of the men. They cooked, sewed and cleaned.



There were also hundreds of women who served on the field of battle. They brought water to pour in hot cannons after they had been fired. People started calling these women "Molly Pitchers."

Margaret Corbin served as a Molly Pitcher. When her husband was killed, she took his place in command of troops firing cannons, although she was badly wounded herself. She was the first woman to receive a veteran's pension.

Civil War



One nurse volunteer was Clara Barton. She saw how much help was needed in time of war and other emergencies. So after the war, she founded the American Red Cross.

The Civil War was the bloodiest war in our country's history. More soldiers died from sickness and wounds that failed to heal than were killed on the battlefield.

After a battle, as many as 20,000 men could have been wounded or killed. At that time, the only trained nurses were nuns. Women from nearby towns helped the wounded on either side. These volunteers had no nursing skills, but they soon learned how to nurse. They were badly needed.

Dr. Mary Walker served as a lieutenant in the Union Army. She was a surgeon. She had special permission from Congress to wear trousers. She was the first and only woman to be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.
