TWIN FALLS - The Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, just east of Arco, is the "preferred alternative" to receive up to 1,950 shipments of nuclear waste over the next 40 years, the federal Energy Department announced Thursday.
The INEL would average nearly one shipment of highly radioactive spent nuclear fuel every week until the year 2035. The shipments could begin shortly after Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary issues a Record of Decision, expected June 1.
Idaho Gov. Phil Batt vowed to fight the shipments if federal officials don't agree to conditions laid down by the state. He could follow

the example set by former Gov. Cecil Andrus, who refused to allow some nuclear waste shipments into Idaho.
Central to Batt's conditions would be federal agreement that Idaho is a temporary stop for nuclear waste - and final disposal will happen somewhere else.
Therefore, Uncle Sam must develop a national storage site for spent nuclear fuel, said Batt spokeswoman Amy Kleiner. Plans for a national storage facility must include firm construction dates and harsh fines for missed deadlines, she said.
Batt said his decision to accept - or fight - more nuclear waste will hinge on three elements: Firm assurance that the waste will, ultimately,

wind up somewhere outside Idaho; clean-up of current radioactive waste stockpiles at the INEL; and more jobs at the INEL.
The INEL sits atop the Eastern Snake River Plain Aquifer, which supplies drinking water for tens of thousands of southern Idaho residents. In a prepared statement, Batt said "... the promise that Idaho will not house a final (nuclear waste) depository over its aquifer must be kept."
Federal promises don't ring true anymore, warned Beatrice Brailsford, a Pocatello-based member of the Snake River Alliance. The alliance is a statewide citizen's group that tracks nuclear threats to Idaho.

Pillsbury to close Buhl milk plant

BUHL - Buhl's evaporated-milk plant - which has provided Magic Valley jobs for 68 years - will close by June 20.
Pillsbury Co. executives told 64 workers Thursday morning that they're shutting the plant which produces Pet brand evaporated milk and B&M baked beans as a cost-saving measure.
That means 300,000 fewer gallons of milk will be passing through Buhl each day. And a plant that each day produced 5,000 cases of canned milk and up to 5,000 cases of baked beans will be vacant. Eventually, the plant will be sold.
Mayor Theodore Pence, who has lived in Buhl for nearly 73 years, said the closure hurts his town. "It's kind of like cutting a leg off. We hope it grows back," he said.
Evaporated milk production will shift to a company cannery in Greeneville, Tenn. Baked-bean production will shift to a B&M factory in Portland, Maine. But chances are slim that displaced workers will get to follow their jobs back East.
"Both of those plants have staffs in

place. We don't expect there to be much by way of relocation opportunities for those plants," said Public Affairs Manager Nancy Perron in a telephone interview from Minneapolis.
The shutdown came as a surprise to many local residents. Not long ago, the plant was flourishing, and Gov. Cecil Andrus was on hand to celebrate its latest building project.
That was before Pillsbury, a subsidiary of the London-based Grand Metropolitan PLC, purchased Pet Inc. for \$2.6 billion early this year, a sale that apparently doomed the Buhl plant.
Pillsbury is downsizing its work force to increase profits. Late last year, it also closed four of its Green Giant vegetable processing plants to save about \$32.8 million per year. The company also sold

OKLAHOMA CITY - As the rubble slowly yielded more dead, the FBI struck back swiftly Thursday and issued arrest warrants for two men suspected of renting the truck that blew apart the federal building with a half-ton of home-brewed explosives.
The death toll rose to 52, making the attack the deadliest bombing in U.S. history. About 150 people remained unaccounted for.
Less than a day and a half after the bombing at the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building, FBI Agent Weldon Kennedy said law enforcement agents are seeking two white men suspected of using aliases to rent the truck. The men's identities are unknown, he said.
Kennedy offered no motive for the attack and no details about the suspects other than a physical description.
In London, a third man, a Jordanian-American described by U.S. officials as a possible witness in the attack, was flown back to the United States for questioning Thursday. Italian officials said his bags, seized in Rome, contained possible bomb-making tools.
However, law enforcement sources in Washington, speaking on condition of anonymity, said they did not think he had

significant knowledge of the bombing.
For most of the day, rescue teams using dogs, fiber-optic cameras and listening devices crawled through the nine-story bulk, looking for signs of life. They briefly suspended their work so shattered columns could be shored up to avert a cave-in.
Jon Hansen, assistant fire chief, said 40 bodies were removed from the bombed-out building, and rescue workers searching a lower level came upon another group of corpses. He said rescuers stopped counting at a dozen.
Gov. Frank Keating reported a firefighter told him: "You find out whoever did this. All I've found in here are a baby's finger and an American flag."

In Washington, Attorney General Janet Reno announced a \$2 million reward for information leading to arrests in the case.
Investigators said the truck was rented April 17, packed with fuel-and-fertilizer explosives and parked outside the office building, where the blast tore away half the structure Wednesday morning and blew a crater 8 feet deep and 30 feet across.
An axle thought to have come from the vehicle was found about two blocks away, said a police source who spoke on condition of anonymity. Major auto parts are marked with an ID number to thwart thieves. Two years ago, the vehicle ID number on a piece of axle enabled investigators to break the World Trade Center bombing case.
A federal law enforcement official, demanding anonymity, said investigators believe the truck was rented in Kansas, and they are checking fertilizer dealers in that state to try to trace the fertilizer used in the bomb.
Dave Russell, a Ryder Truck Rental official, said the FBI contacted his company about a truck rented from Elliott's Body Shop in Junction City, Kan., about 270 miles from Oklahoma City. Russell said he could not comment further.

Rescue worker calls wreckage 'cave filled with booby traps'

OKLAHOMA CITY - Bodies were buried so deeply under the rubble that John Brozek was looking for any sign whatsoever of a human being.
He found it in thick sheets of insulation from third-floor ceilings that collapsed on ground level when the bomb went off. "The only way to find a body is the insulation. It's red. It's soaked with blood," Brozek said.

Shining his flashlight through dark tunnels of contorted metal, concrete beams and jumbled office furniture, he followed the trails of the once-yellow insulation.
Wearing fatigues, a hard hat and a surgical face mask to keep out the dust, Brozek, a sergeant at Tinker Air Force Base, joined hundreds of other searchers in exploring every accessible corner, crevice and closet.
From 7 p.m. Wednesday until 3 a.m. Thursday, Brozek crawled through a former federal building that one doctor now

described as a "cave filled with booby traps."
Sometimes the walls started to vibrate and workers were told to leave. Twenty-four hours after the blast, only about half the building had been searched and secured.
Brozek looked for the living, but found mostly dead.
In eight hours, he carried out five body bags. "In some cases, he couldn't distinguish a man from a woman.

"You can't handle it," Brozek said, shaking his head. "You can't believe this is a body you're carrying."
Loss applications and a desk nameplate, that said "loan officer" told Brozek he was in what was once the third-floor credit union. Several bodies were in the rubble, but he didn't know just where in the nine-story building they had come from.
He dug amid the debris, finding check books and two purses he hoped would help identify the dead.

Idaho weather summary

By midafternoon Thursday areas of precipitation had spread into southeastern Idaho with Malad and Soda Springs reporting showers of rain or snow.

April snow blankets mountains of West; storms hit wide area

Thunderstorms spread from Texas into the Ohio Valley with heavy rain and high wind Thursday, and heavy snow fell in the mountains of the West.

Bands of strong thunderstorms shifted from eastern Texas and the lower Mississippi Valley across the Gulf Coast states and through the Tennessee and Ohio valleys.

One storm heavily damaged three houses near Bastrop, La. Wind gusts to 65 mph were reported at Greenville, Miss., along with hail as big as golf balls.

Late Wednesday, the weather system spawned thunderstorms accompanied by a tornado in northern Texas. The storms damaged apartment complexes in Fort Worth and Dallas, knocked down power lines and overturned a police car.

Forensic work leads to breakthrough

WASHINGTON — Within hours of Wednesday's devastating bombing in Oklahoma City the FBI knew where the van packing the explosives came from and had a description of the two men, apparently U.S. citizens, who allegedly rented it, federal officials said Thursday.

Pieces of the truck scattered as far as 200 yards from ground zero, and reportedly from a video camera in an automated banking machine that had caught the building in its scope, authorities quickly traced the truck to a Ryder Truck Rental office in Junction City, Kan., about 250 miles north.

There, they got the physical description of the two white men, who used false IDs, that led to composite drawings made public Thursday.

A knowledgeable counterterrorism source said late Thursday authorities now know the true identity of the men and have linked both to narcotics investigations.

Ryder officials would not discuss the case. The Junction City police referred all questions to the FBI and a spokesman at nearby Fort Riley also declined to comment.

U.S. officials said the investigation is just beginning, and there may be much more than those two men behind the explosion. So while there is now the massive hunt for the two suspects, behind the scenes authorities are sweeping the country for fresh leads and corroborating them and are combing foreign sources for assistance as well.

Though the two suspects identified so far appear to be Americans, U.S. officials have not ruled out a Middle East connection to the bombing and an administration official said that the CIA was developing leads suggesting "a foreign-based terrorism group having involvement." The official declined to elaborate.

The early breakthroughs were apparently the fruits of forensic work rather than intelligence gathering.

Weldon Kennedy, the FBI official who is heading the investigation from Oklahoma City, said at a news conference Thursday that it was "forensic evidence" that led to the identification of the truck allegedly containing the explosives.

CNN reported three men of Middle Eastern background were arrested — two in Dallas, one in Oklahoma City — on immigration charges and were being questioned in the bombing.

The men had stopped to ask an Oklahoma Highway Patrol officer for directions Wednesday, and the officer was suspicious enough to write down their car's license plate number — which turned out to be registered to a rental car and not the vehicle they were driving, the network said.

However, an official at the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Washington denied INS had anyone in custody in Dallas or Oklahoma City.

A law enforcement source in New York told The Associated Press that one of the men named in CNN, Asad R. Siddiqy, a cab driver from Queens, arrived in Oklahoma

(radioactive) material will be moved outside our state," Brailsford said, "but it's still here."

She described the Energy Department's announcement as "business as usual." The last Energy Department estimate for radioactive waste shipments to INEL was 1,800 — not 1,950, Brailsford said.

"There is an assumption within the federal agencies that Idahoans are too stupid to count," she said in a telephone interview. "The DOE has always regarded Idaho as a spent nuclear fuel sinkhole, and so has the nuclear navy."

Brailsford urged opponents of nuclear waste shipments to telephone Batt to strengthen his resolve. Batt's office number is 208-334-2100.

The U.S. Navy is poised to send 40 to 60 shipments of spent nuclear fuel to Idaho shortly after O'Leary announces her decision, Brailsford said. The Navy has been shipping spent fuel rods from its nuclear reactors to the INEL since the 1950s.

Even though there have been at least three train derailments near Gooding and Shoshone in the past year, some of the new shipments would come to Idaho by rail. The Energy Department is not responsible for trains hauling radioactive waste, said Brad Bugger, an INEL-based spokesman for the Energy Department.

"Those track concerns are the concern of Union Pacific, not the Department of Energy," Bugger said.

The Association of American Railroads doesn't agree, Brailsford said.

"The railroad industry believes that the DOE should assume the responsibility for the consequences of an accident involving a (nuclear waste) cask," she said, citing a Feb. 1 statement by the Association of American Railroads.

Brailsford said the Energy Department should reconsider its responsibility for safe transport of nuclear waste. Special safety precautions are required for trains hauling radioactive waste and — so far — none have derailed in Idaho.

offer other vegetable plants including Buhl's either major employer, a corn-and-pea packinghouse now owned by New York-based Seneca.

Officials at Pillsbury's Minneapolis headquarters have declined to reveal how much money will be saved by closing Buhl's milk and bean plant.

Plant manager Craig Ollinger said Thursday was a "sad day" for workers. Employees were allowed to go home early after the shutdown was announced. "People weren't too eager about staying around today," he explained.

Ollinger praised plant workers and the community but said the closure couldn't be avoided. "Everybody worked together to make this place as successful as we could," he added.

Mayor Pence lamented the loss of a major Buhl employer. "These people here are some of the finest people we have around," he said. "You really hate to lose them, but I guess economic factors dictate what happens."

Pence said the plant has been around about as long as he can remember, buying milk from local dairymen and providing jobs for the folks in town. Its demise will have "quite an impact" on the town, he added.

City Council President Tom Tappan said Thursday's announcement was an unexpected blow. "I think it hurts Buhl because we need all the jobs we can get here. Most of the new jobs go to Twin Falls so we try to hang onto the jobs we've got."

Tappan said the town's economic development council will work to bring a new employer to the Pet milk plant and city government will try to "make life easier for whoever wants to come in."

Unable to talk, bombing victim manages still to communicate

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Speckled with scars, a breathing tube in his mouth... a gauze patch over a swollen eye, he had lost two-thirds of his blood from a gashed carotid artery. Randy Ledger, a maintenance worker in the bomb-wrecked federal building, couldn't talk — but he had things he needed to say.

Feebly, he lifted a pad of paper Thursday in his intensive-care room. Wrists resting on his chest, he wrote notes. And notes, and notes.

He told his parents he had left everything to them. "I don't make it" but then tried to cheer them with a joke when they asked to stay at his apartment; "Sure! Clean it!"

He thanked the nurses "for the gentleness."

He wondered and worried about the General Services Administration co-worker he said had saved him but was unaccounted for now.

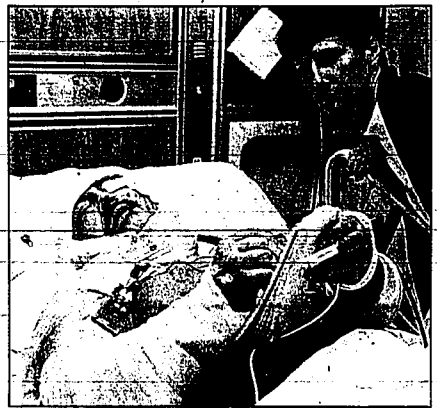
And he grieved for the day-care children he had left only a moment before the bomb went off.

"I heard that this might be terrorists. How," he wrote slowly, painfully, "can anyone justify the murder of children for anything?"

He also communicated with hand squeezes and tears.

"He's just been crying about the children," said Sandra Dodger, one of the Presbyterian Hospital nurses Ledger thanked.

A day after the explosion and the surgery that saved him, hospital monitors loomed at Ledger's side, their changing digital readouts glowing. Intravenous lines fed him antibiotics. Tubes from a breathing machine

stretched to his mouth because neck swelling inhibited breathing. Still, when visitors entered his room he managed a half-wave.

Ms. Dodger said Ledger, 38, had received six pints of blood, about two-thirds of the average body's total, to make up for losses from two cut arteries in his neck, one of them the thick,

throbbing carotid artery. That wound was filled with dirt and the dust of pulverized concrete.

"He would have died in minutes if someone hadn't found him," she said.

That's one of Ledger's deepest concerns. Another note explains: "I could swear that was Mike who found me."

He also communicated with hand squeezes and tears.

"He's just been crying about the children," said Sandra Dodger, one of the Presbyterian Hospital nurses Ledger thanked.

A day after the explosion and the surgery that saved him, hospital monitors loomed at Ledger's side, their changing digital readouts glowing. Intravenous lines fed him antibiotics. Tubes from a breathing machine

Muslim leaders ask country for fairness

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Islamic groups condemned the bombing of the federal building and said they fear a backlash against Muslims.

"We know we've been labeled, and it won't go away until this is cleared up. We want the perpetrators to be caught and to be given the death penalty," said Jibal Abdul Raheem Aziz, leader of the Islamic Community of Oklahoma.

But some local politicians noted Oklahoma City was the site of a 1992 Islamic conference featuring inflammatory rhetoric, and they cited parallels to the World Trade Center blast, in which the suspects had Middle Eastern backgrounds.

Baby pictured in dramatic photo dies

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Unidentified in death even by sex, the baby who was carried from the smoking ruins of the federal building in a photograph displayed on front pages around the world ended up as another of the bombing's victims.

The child was pronounced dead by emergency medical technicians, said firefighter Chris Fields, whose attempt to rescue the baby was captured by an amateur photographer and transmitted world-

wide by The Associated Press.

The photographer, bank clerk Charles H. Porter IV, figured when he first heard the explosion that demolition crews were tearing down a building and he'd have a chance to snap some neat amateur photos with his camera.

Instead, five minutes later, he came upon a policeman carrying a baby up from the smoking ruins of a federal building ravaged by a car bomb explosion.

The policeman, Sgt. John Avera, handed the limp, bleeding baby to Fields as Porter snapped away.

It's unclear exactly when the youngster died. Fields said emergency medical workers pronounced the child dead on arrival.

The child was believed to have been in a government day care center on the second floor of the building. Neither the center's operator nor a worker could identify the child from the photos.

Oklahoma bombing brings terror home to Americans

"There is no tariff on fear."

— Sinclair Lewis, "It Can't Happen Here"

Whoever ignited the car bomb in front of the federal building in Oklahoma City had you in mind, Magic Valley.

They were thinking of every placid nook and cranny of an America that prides itself in its great, implacable invulnerability, a country that, against all odds, navigated the 20th century without its children being killed in their beds.

Kids who grow up in the streets of Belfast or Beirut expect terror to be just around the corner, and the way much of the world lives, hopes, dreams and conducts its everyday business reflects the philosophy that malice is faceless, methodical and lethal.

Impersonal terror as a means of getting or keeping political power changes the way people see themselves, their institutions, their future. Theodore Roosevelt believed the absence of that fear was one of the things that made America different, special, unique.

He believed, rightly, that democracy is born of stability and security because trust is such an implicit part of representative government. He also thought, perhaps naively, that the blessings of geography and self-reliance would allow America to keep the Old World's ancient, mindless furies at bay.

Ours, after all, is one of the few major powers in history that has built a philosophy of government predicated on detachment, even in an era of widespread nuclear weapons. Isolationism is as American as cherry pie, and it's still alive and healthy in important elements of both the Republican and Democratic parties.

—We Americans could always afford that luxury, for at the end of the day, we could leave places like Korea and Vietnam and come home to our heartland to dream untroubled dreams.

Those dreams are untroubled no longer, which is precisely what the authors of the Oklahoma City madness intended. Fear is a powerful catalyst for change; it causes peoples, nations, governments to take sides and to act in ways that are sometimes not in their long-term best interests.

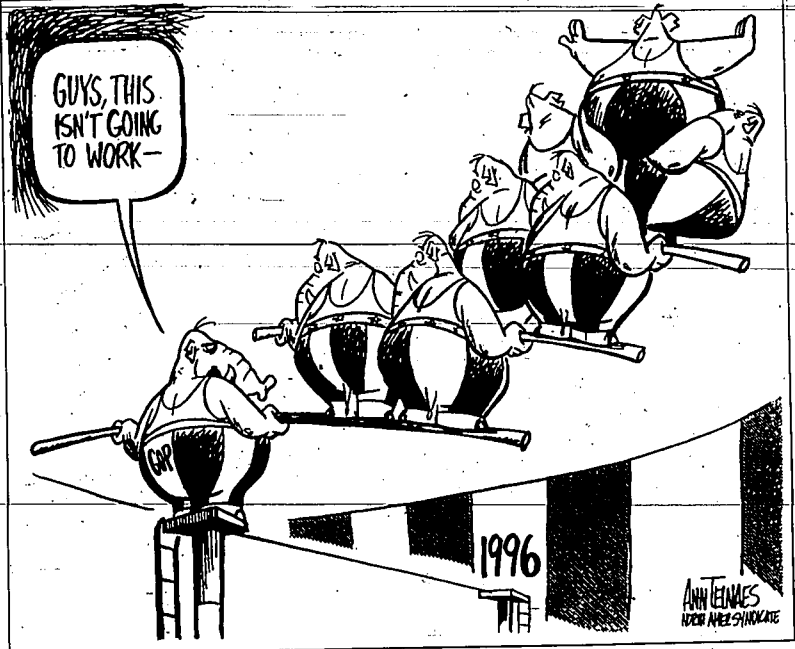
But fear, as Franklin Roosevelt pointed out, is a chimera. It lacks any substance beyond the follies its exacts from those who are afraid.

Our greatest mistake in the aftermath of the Oklahoma City bombing would be to allow ourselves to become trapped in the cycle of old hatred that in all likelihood prompted this act. When the killers are found, the best vengeance is simple justice — sure, swift and complete.

Still, vengeance is only as good as the vigilance that follows it, and it's clear that America's intelligence-gathering apparatus has to do a better job of keeping track of the evil that men dream in the back alleys of places like Gaza and Peshawar.

On the other hand, we would be mistaken to let the anguish of the moment stampede us into trading some of our cherished domestic freedoms for a greater sense of security.

If vigilance deteriorates into fear, then the Oklahoma City bombers have already won — and we as a nation have lost far more than our innocence.



Be cheerful — things can be much worse

SPOKANE, Wash. — As we contemplate the happy prospect of having one giant federal welfare bureaucracy replaced by 50 medium-sized welfare bureaucracies, from Olympia to Pierre to Augusta, certain conclusions are forced upon us.

First, if the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AF-SCME — remember that acronym; you'll be seeing it often) were a corporation instead of a union, its stock would now be soaring on Wall Street. Growth guaranteed.

Numero Two-o, no matter what happens in the future, 25 states are going to be below average. In an uncertain world, I believe it is still safe to bet that Mississippi, our perennial last-place finisher, will continue its peculiar tradition.

But there could be some real surprises among the top-rankers. Here in the Pacific Northwest, notorious as the home of tree huggers and owl lovers, the local legislature has been on an anti-environmental tear. Talking about devolution, the Republican plan to put more power and responsibility back at the state level, one can strike terror in the hearts of listeners with the simple question: "Do you know what your state legislature is doing right now?"

To the extent that all state legislatures are Bozoland — and all of them are; if you don't believe it, go look at your own — we count on them for at least a minimal degree of charming nonsense, stupidity and cupidly every session. They often exceed our expectations.

Here in the corner of the nation once called Ecotopia, the Washington Legislature has just passed a bill to compensate property owners for losses caused by regulation. Initiative 164, backed by the builders and de-

velopers of the state, squeaked through the state Senate with the help of two defecting Democrats. With an impressive display of "damn the consequences," members were uninfluenced by arguments that the measure would virtually wipe out zoning laws and cost the government a fortune.

If the measure turns out to be the disaster that its opponents predict, legislators seem prepared to respond, "Well, it seemed like a good idea at the time." This cheerful "je ne sais quoi" applies to a remarkably murky bill entitled the Private Property Regulatory Fairness Act. Initiative 164 would require government to pay landowners for any loss of property value caused by land-use restrictions and to take the least restrictive approach to growth management.

The exception is that governments could still prevent land developments considered to be public nuisances without having to pay anything, but no one is sure what that covers. A merry time will be had by all working this out. If a property owner wants to sell hunting leases for golden eagles on his land, can the state prevent it without paying?

The state House has also moved to abolish the Puget Sound Water Quality Authority,

causing those who live on Puget Sound to have editorial anxiety attacks of a most plaintive nature. Indeed, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer was moved to accuse certain members of "bovineheaded pettiness."

Now, I yield to no one in the bovineheaded-pettiness category on behalf of my Texas Legislature; our claim to pre-eminence is rich, deep and long. But it will be fascinating to see how many other state legislatures descend toward bovineheaded-pettiness or positively Texan proportions without the dread federal mandates to keep them from running amok, bovineheaded-pettinesswise.

Our state legislatures could easily surpass Stephen King in the production of horror scenarios. The enviros' nightmare is that the states get into bidding wars for new bedness by undercutting one another in both state taxes and laxness of environmental regulation. Ironically, surveys show that most businesses choose where to locate on the basis of quality of life, especially attractive environment and good schools.

Do we doubt that, absent federal standards saying, "You cannot go below this minimum," our legislatures will do just that? Did Texas move to improve conditions in state prisons before we got hauled into federal court over them? No. Did Texas move to clean up state homes for the retarded and mentally ill before a federal court forced us to do so? No. Did Texas move to pay for its public schools on an equitable basis before the courts made us do it? No. Has Texas ever voluntarily been out front of the feds on any environmental standard?

No. Safety standard? No. Public health standard? No.

And so I say again to you, all, friends and foes alike, that now is the time to be cheerful — because things can always get worse.

Hypertension analysis incomplete

Several weeks ago your paper published an abbreviated narrative of an analysis that was done by Dr. Bruce Psaty, an epidemiologist from the University of Washington concerning the use of calcium channel blockers (CCBs) in hypertensive patients. Dr. Psaty had concluded those hypertensive patients receiving CCBs were more likely to experience heart attacks than patients receiving other blood pressure drugs.

What was not reported was the fact that Dr. Psaty had stated that there could be confounding factors in this analysis and that the only way to be sure whether his conclusions were correct was to conduct a large, randomized, prospective, well-controlled study which is yet to be conducted and published.

Pharmacists have been fielding questions and unfounded concerns from the public on this matter for weeks now. Unfortunately, some hypertensive patients resorted to discontinuation of necessary medication without knowing all the facts of this case because they were frightened by what they read in your paper.

There are other important facts which should be known about this analysis which was pointed out by Dr. Anthony de Padovance, president of Medical Affairs for Knoll Pharmaceuticals.

First, and most important, it is difficult to draw accurate conclusions based on a retrospective analysis such as this.

It was difficult to determine from this analysis if any one class of blood pressure medication was more likely to increase or decrease the risk of a heart attack.

Dr. Psaty and others agree that his study was not definitive and the day-to-day risk to an individual taking a CCB is minuscule.

In the best public interest, unsubstantiated conclusions should not be presented to the public without review by a competent medical professional and accompaniment of an explanation that would provide the information needed by your readers to construct an educated opinion on the subject. A preview of such information by a medical professional before publication is advised.

Dairy issues need to be discussed

It was with great interest that I read the article in *The Times-News* concerning the Hank Hafliger Dairy. First, let me say I think that Mr. Brock was trying to be fair and tell all sides of the story. However, there are several points in the article that I feel need to be discussed.

First and foremost, the dairy industry needs to respond to the idea that all of the sudden we are not part of agriculture. This is not at all true. There is no logical reason to classify the larger dairies as industrial. Just because the Western style of dairying is different from what you were used to doesn't disconnect it from being agriculture.

I put forth the argument that other segments of agriculture are not the same as they were 50, 40 or even 10 years ago. Why, then, should you ask the dairy industry to use the same practices of the past? The

American consumer is asking agriculture to produce food at a less expensive rate. The laws of economics have dictated that we can produce dairy products for the cheaper price by using new technology and larger cow numbers.

Once again we see the society blaming the dairy industry for all the happenings that are negative. It has not been scientifically proven that the dairy is the reason why the water table has dropped. In fact there are several factors, like the drought and other increases in pumping. Likewise increased nitrates in the water shouldn't be blamed on the dairy until proven. In fact, research supports the idea that properly constructed lagoons and undisturbed lots do develop a compacted manure/soil interfacial layer that provides an excellent moisture seal.

The use of water resources by dairies is a major concern by some. However, comparing the annual usage of water to the

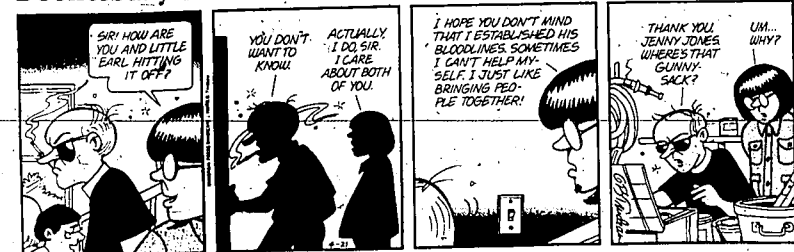
rest of agriculture the typical dairy with 2,100 cows and 300 heifers will use 38.2 million gallons per season. In addition, the wash pen and barn water will be used to irrigate crops. The consumptive use of water for the dairy is about 25 million gallons, well below the consumptive use for croplands. On 60 acres of cropland, seasonal usage ranges from 54.1 million gallons for beans to 93.3 million gallons for alfalfa.

These are some of the facts. The Hafliger Dairy is trying to be a good neighbor. If the other people listed in the article would visit with Hank instead of going to the press, I'm sure he would be receptive to their thoughts. At the same time, they need to understand that they live in an agricultural area.

Earthquake jolts southern Philippines

MANILA, Philippines—A moderate earthquake shook southern Philippines Thursday, causing panic and traffic jams in at least one city. No damage was reported.

The 5.5-magnitude tremor was centered in the Philippine Sea, about 620 miles southeast of Manila, said Aimee Guanio, a spokesperson for the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology.

In Iligan, a city 190 miles northeast of the epicenter, panicky residents poured into the streets as buildings and market stalls swayed. Some terrified shoppers screamed, "Quake, quake! Run for your life!" Guanio said the quake was caused by underground plate movements within the Philippine Fault Zone.

French enshrine Curie at monument

PARIS—Making amends for centuries of Gallic sexism, male leaders watched Thursday as the ashes of brilliant scientist Marie Curie were enshrined in the Pantheon, the first woman honored at the memorial to the nation's "great men."

The ceremony at the majestic domed monument, draped with a huge French flag, was a symbolic triumph for French women's rights activists and a dramatic farewell gesture by President Francois Mitterrand.

On Mitterrand's order, the ashes of Marie Curie and her husband, Pierre Curie, were transferred from a small-town cemetery and carried in wood coffins into the Pantheon. The couple shared the Nobel Prize for physics in 1903, and she alone won the chemistry Nobel in 1911.

Yugoslav dissident Djilas dead at 83

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia—Milovan Djilas, who transformed himself from one of communism's foremost advocates into its first prominent dissident, died today. He was 83.

Djilas, once heir to Yugoslavia's Communist leader Josip Broz Tito, died of heart failure at his central Belgrade home.

Djilas, who chronicled his life and the history of communism in eastern Europe, is probably best known for having challenged the Stalinist system in his 1957 book "The New Class." The book was smuggled to the United States shortly before Djilas was jailed for the first time under Tito, his wartime comrade and onetime close ally.

Non-Jewish Russians on rise in Israel

JERUSALEM—About one-fifth of the 550,000 immigrants from the former Soviet Union who have reached Israel since 1989 are not Jewish, and the percentage has been rising, an immigration official said Thursday.

Ultra-orthodox Jewish leaders said the government was underestimating the number of non-Jews coming to Israel and called for immigration restrictions. They said up to 40 percent of the Russian immigrants are not Jewish.

Amnon Beer, a spokesman for the Immigrant Absorption Ministry, said many of the non-Jews are spouses of Jews and are entitled to immigrate under Israel's "Law of Return."

Death toll grows to 21 in Polish blast

GDANSK, Poland—Rescuers called off the search Thursday for survivors of a gas explosion that destroyed an 11-story apartment building and killed at least 21 people.

Police say detached gas valves and tools found in the basement indicate someone caused the explosion Monday in this Baltic port city. The first three floors of the building collapsed, leaving it tilting dangerously.

After recovering nine bodies, rescuers had to hold off Tuesday while military experts demolished the unstable top seven floors. Twelve bodies have been recovered from the rubble since then.

Mexico no-show at talks with rebels

SAN ANDRES LARRAINZAR, Mexico (AP)—Government negotiators failed to show up Thursday for the first peace talks in over a year.

They were put off by the hundreds of peasants who set up camp in town to show support for guerrilla leaders.

The night before, angry government officials had warned the surprise demonstration by rebel sympathizers could jeopardize the peace process.

"The fight goes on!" throngs of Indian farmers in sandals and straw hats shouted when the rebel negotiators arrived Wednesday night. "Long live the Zapatista National Liberation Army!"

Although there has been no fighting since January 1994, the government's failure to end the Zapatista rebellion in the southern state of Chiapas has contributed to the sense of crisis in Mexico over the past 16 months.

Last month the two sides agreed to meet in San Andres Larrainzar for their first formal talks in more than a year, to be held in a hastily constructed building on the dusty town's basketball court.

Talks were to begin Thursday morning, but had not by early afternoon.

The Interior Ministry said late Wednesday the demonstration was "obviously planned" with the rebels

and "could put at risk the beginning of peace talks."

Interior Minister Esteban Moctezuma said Thursday the government had the "political will" to achieve peace in Chiapas, but he would not comment on the delay, the official Mexican news agency Notimex reported.

Iraqi officials stop diplomat from visiting 2 Americans

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP)—For the third straight time, Iraqi authorities refused Thursday to let a Polish diplomat visit two Americans imprisoned near Baghdad.

Iraqi sources say his visits have been cut back to once every two weeks.

The diplomat, Ryszard Krystosik, is the Americans' contact with Washington, which does not have diplomatic relations with Iraq. Krystosik had been told he could have weekly visiting rights.

It was not clear why the Iraqi authorities changed their minds. The sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the weekly visits violated Iraqi prison regulations.

Baghdad blames the United States for blocking efforts to ease U.N. economic sanctions imposed after Iraq invaded Kuwait on Aug. 2, 1990.

Krystosik last visited the Americans' David Daliberti, 41, of Jacksonville, Fla., and William

Barloon, 39, of New Hampton, Iowa.—April 13. He was supposed to visit the men Tuesday when Iraqi authorities first told him he could not see them. On Wednesday he asked again and similarly was rebuffed.

Daliberti and Barloon were arrested March 13 and sentenced to eight-year terms March 25 for illegally entering Iraq from Kuwait.

U.S. officials said the two men, who worked for U.S. defense contractors in Kuwait, were trying to visit friends at a U.N. border post and accidentally strayed into Iraq. Iraq contends the men may have been on a spy mission.

Applications have been made through the U.S. Embassy in Amman, Jordan, for their wives to travel to Iraq to see the men. Burns said the Iraqis usually tell applicants that it takes five days to get a reply.

U.S., N. Korea meeting on nukes breaks down

BERLIN (AP)—Talks between the United States and North Korea broke down Thursday with the two sides unable to agree on a plan to prevent the Communist nation from restarting a nuclear program capable of producing weapons.

The talks, which had resumed Tuesday, broke down after only 15 minutes of discussion.

Kim Jong U, head of the North Korean delegation, said the talks remained deadlocked and would not be continued.

Chief U.S. negotiator Gary Samore declined to comment.

The Americans were reported to have presented a compromise that would keep North Korea from carrying out its threat to

restart its plutonium-producing nuclear reactor.

North Korea had threatened to restart its program unless an agreement was reached by Friday.

The Communist nation agreed to freeze its nuclear program last October and accept two light-water reactors as replacements in a deal that also included economic and diplomatic benefits.

But North Korea has objected to U.S. insistence it accept the new reactors from rival South Korea. Those light-water units produce far less weapons-grade plutonium than North Korea's current graphite reactor from Russia.

The North Koreans also fear that a flood of engineers from South Korea would include intelligence agents.

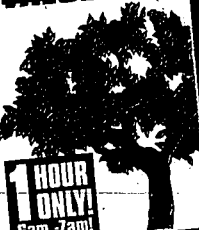

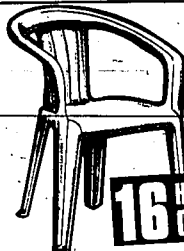

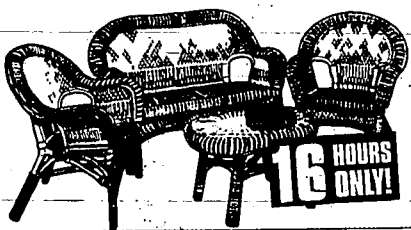

Man faces manslaughter in drunken-driving death

LEWISTON - Nineteen-year-old Orin Alexander has been bound over to 2nd District Court on charges of vehicular manslaughter and aggravated drunken driving in the death of a former Twin Falls man.

Alexander is accused of killing Troy McCormick, 23, on March 16. McCormick's wife and 3-year-old daughter were injured.

During a preliminary hearing Wednesday, Lewiston Police Sgt. Alan Johnson testified Alexander admitted he had some beers and was showing off when his pickup hit McCormick's car.

"He said he should not have been driving," Johnson said, referring to a transcript of his interview with Alexander.

Nez Perce County Prosecutor Denise Rosen said tests show Alexander's blood-alcohol content was .18, nearly twice Idaho's legal limit for driving.

His passenger, Laura Bay, 17, said Alexander cried, "Oh my God, I just killed a guy" when he got out of the truck and saw McCormick pinned in the car. He died at the scene.

Witness Brent Hassell estimated the truck was traveling at 80 mph in the 25 mph zone.

Magistrate Gary Elliott scheduled arraignment for May 3.

Jerome house suffers damage in chimney fire Wednesday

JEROME - A chimney fire Wednesday burned the second floor of a family's home.

Deb and Larod Bouvette and their three children were not injured, said Joe Robinette, chief of the Jerome Rural Fire Department. They are staying with friends, he said.

Abortion splits Idaho conservatives

TWIN FALLS - Abortion must not be the litmus test for who is on the Republican presidential ticket in 1996, U.S. Rep. Michael Crapo, R-Idaho, said Thursday.

That worries "pro-family" activist Dennis Mansfield, who says Crapo and other Washington, D.C., conservatives may be "buying the lies of Bob Dole and Phil Gramm," the two leading GOP presidential candidates.

In Heyburn, Idaho Citizens Alliance Chairman Kelly Walton says the GOP ticket must contain two pro-life candidates, or he'll abandon it next year. Walton told The

Times-News that many social conservatives will jump ship if the GOP forsakes its long-standing opposition to abortion-on-demand.

Mansfield said millions of Republicans are counting on the party to defend life. He warned GOP politicians to reject the "stupid, foolish, gutless mentality of the Beltway" that is causing some conservatives to waffle on the issue.

The Republican Party Platform has been anti-abortion - and the ticket has contained two pro-lifers - since Ronald Reagan was nominated for president in 1980. But some Republicans say the party's anti-abortion position contributed to George Bush's electoral loss in 1992. They would like the party to soften its stance.

Asked if the 1996 nominees should both be pro-life, Crapo said, "I don't think that the abortion issue should control the political decision."

"We've got to recognize that there are Republicans who are pro-life and there are Republicans who are pro-choice. I think that it's important for us to not make a litmus test either way," Crapo added.

He suggested the GOP is in a catch-22 on the issue. "Whichever choice that's made, it's going to make trouble with the other side."

Idaho pro-lifers made it clear Thursday that there'll be trouble if the wrong choice is made at the GOP Convention in San Diego.

"If the Republican Party thinks it can ditch its long-standing position in defense

Bomb hoax evacuates hospital

TWIN FALLS - More than two dozen sick patients were wheeled out of Twin Falls Clinic & Hospital Thursday after a secretary at a law office misundersstood a false bomb threat that was actually aimed at a department store miles away.

A day after the bombing of a federal building in Oklahoma City, nurses, doctors and nursing students calmly yet swiftly evacuated 26 patients on wheelchairs and gurneys to nearby St. Edward's Catholic Church and Parish Hall.

After calling the office of Twin Falls attorney Paula Brown Sinclair, who has a telephone number similar to Twin Falls Clinic & Hospital's - about a bomb at J.C. Penney, the man also called the Magic Valley Mall office with the false report, said Twin Falls Police Sgt. Jim Mildon.

Sinclair's secretary is accustomed to receiving the clinic's wrong-number calls and apparently thought the threat was aimed at the hospital.

Using a dog, police searched both J.C. Penney and the Shoshone Street East hospital, Mildon said. Police do not know why the man called Sinclair's office to say there was a bomb at J.C. Penney, he said.

Sinclair said she was not at her office when the call came into her office and would not let The Times-News talk to the person who answered the call. The secretary took "appropriate action," Sinclair said.

Twin Falls Clinic & Hospital patients stayed in the church's buildings for about an hour. Hospital Administrator Brent Bodily said he found out later Thursday afternoon that the hospital was not the target for the man's appalling prank.

"We had no other choice but to react in a prudent manner," Bodily said. "When ... you get a call like that, you have to do what you have to do."

"Certainly the staff, the nurses and the rest of the facility proved that we're more than

capable of handling an emergency situation." Many patients were elderly, and many needed oxygen, intravenous fluids and vital-sign monitors. Extra oxygen tanks, blankets, pillows and crash carts were required from the hospital during the evacuation.

"No one suffered any complications through this, but that is in fact the biggest risk," said Nursing Director Ron Fisse, adding that some patients couldn't be monitored during the scare.

Batt picks Dietrich welfare mother

DIETRICH - As the only welfare recipient on Gov. Phil Batt's new State Welfare Reform Advisory Council, single mother Jill VanSant has a lot of work ahead of her.

But before VanSant can tackle the issues surrounding welfare reform, the 30-year-old College of Southern Idaho student wants to finish spring classes and take about three weeks to prepare before council meetings start in June.

"I can't do both," said VanSant, who also has four children aged 3 to 8.

VanSant said she found out Wednesday that she was appointed to the governor's advisory council, which has been asked to address welfare reform in Idaho and help eliminate reliance on welfare. Paty Brown, regional Department of Health and Welfare program manager for medical and financial assistance, nominated VanSant to the council after hearing her speak

at a Head Start Conference, VanSant said. As part of Idaho's approach to reforming welfare, statewide public meetings also may be held to get comments on the programs.

Soon after separating from her husband in late 1993, VanSant applied for welfare assistance, she said in an interview last year. VanSant was one of several welfare recipients interviewed for local stories about national welfare reform.

A couple of months after getting welfare payments, VanSant started making the hour-long commute from Dietrich to CSI in Twin Falls so she could get some skills to support her young family.

Now VanSant has about a year left to complete an associate's degree in child development at CSI, where she has a work-study job at the Center for New Directions. Working at Head Start or getting a degree in either counseling or teaching may be her next step, VanSant said Thursday.

State teachers won't be tested anymore

IDAHO FALLS - Idaho teachers no longer have to take the National Teachers Examination.

The State Board of Education on Thursday voted to do away with the test, which has been criticized as biased against minorities and as a faulty test of a teacher's abilities.

About 2,000 people a year took the test, which has been the sole determinant in licensing teachers.

"You could come out of college with a 4.0, be student teacher of the year ... But if you didn't pass the NTE, you couldn't teach," said state

certification director Jim Smith.

Failure rate for minorities taking the test is 80 percent, while the general failure rate is 8 percent, he said.

High failure rates reflect a bias in the test, wrote Charles H. Hayes, chairman of the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee to Roy Mosman, president of the state board.

"There have been numerous studies that show that standardized tests do not take into consideration the cultural aspects of the test-takers; and because of this such tests are biased," he wrote. "We urge that the new system of licensing teachers in Idaho be implemented as soon as possible."

Woman reports car-jacking

TWIN FALLS - A woman told police she was abducted by a young man Wednesday night who snuck into her car at a gas station.

Kristy Mace, 20, told police she was forced to drive the man across town, then the man fled when she pulled into a friend's driveway honking her horn, according to a police report.

Investigators: Calls were not from Blackfoot phone

POCATELLO (AP) — Investigators have determined that threatening telephone calls about a bomb device on the Ten Commandments monument on the Bannock County Courthouse lawn were not made from a Blackfoot cellular telephone.

Through a remote device that did not require using the telephone, that method is called cloning, he said. Someone called police and local television stations about 2:30 a.m. last Thursday, warning that a bomb had been planted at the monument. Police cordoned off the area and summoned a bomb team from Mountain Home Air Force Base.

The device was defused. Police say they aren't certain it contained dynamite. Nelson said police are interviewing people who were called from the number at about the same time the bomb threats were called in. The bomb scare forced the evacuation of residents and closure of businesses and government offices.

Dual-enrollment law 'flawed'

IDAHO FALLS — Idaho's dual-enrollment law contains serious errors, state education officials said Thursday, and the State Board of Education isn't sure how to correct the problems.

The flaws are: The law sets different standards for public school students who participate in extracurricular activities and non-public students who wish to participate. The board does not currently require students to take achievement tests that would be used to determine eligibility for activities.

The bill states that all students must be subject to the same rules and requirements for participating in public school programs or activities. But it also says a non-public student could be eligible for extracurricular activities by getting an average or better score on achievement tests required annually by the state board.

The laws are mechanical rather than philosophical, said board member Curtis Eaton of Twin Falls. "Ignore the bill altogether," he said. "The idea of dual enrollment is a good one." Unfortunately, school districts can't ignore the law, which goes into effect July 1. Deputy Attorney General Kirby Nelson said the board must come up with a way to deal with the law before then.

School officials identified two flaws in the bill, which allows students to enroll in schools part-time and permits home-schooled students to enroll in extracurricular activities at public schools. Nolan Mechem, president of the Idaho High School Activities Associations, said the bill's language means that any students could participate in sports and debate if their achievement test scores are high enough, even if they got D's

The second glitch is that the board does not currently require students to take achievement tests. The Iowa Tests of Basic Skills is not offered in every grade. The board may have to propose a statewide test by July 1, Nelson said. "I have no problem with home-schooled kids participating in school activities," said Tom Dillon, representative from Caldwell. "This is not the issue. The issue is, this is a fatally flawed bill. This is terrible legislation."

Judge rules on petition Police perform polygraph tests

BURLEY - Police were not obligated to seize the driver's license of a woman stopped under suspicion of driving drunk, 5th District Judge George Granata Jr. ruled Thursday.

Granata denied a petition by attorney David Pena asking that prosecutors be forced to take away his client's license after a breath test showed she was legally drunk when pulled over on Jan. 24.

Police did not seize the license of Rhonda Haynes despite an administrative law mandating that drunken drivers have their licenses taken away immediately.

Drunken drivers whose licenses were being suspended under the law successfully challenged driving under the influence charges. Those challenges resulted in the dropping of DUI charges because it was argued defendants were being punished twice.

The Idaho Legislature has since issued a moratorium on the law.

The Cassia County Sheriff's Department stopped seizing licenses in January following a ruling by Minidoka County Magistrate Judge Roy Holloway.

In the courtroom Thursday, Pena argued that police and the prosecutor's office did not have the discretion of when to enforce the law.

Cassia County Prosecuting Attorney Stephen Bywater said Haynes had no right to be charged. He added that the Legislature's suspension of the law upheld the county's decision not to seize Haynes' license.

BURLEY - Police are administering polygraph tests to some of the people being interviewed in connection with the death of Regina Krieger.

Cassia County Sheriff's Department investigators have asked four or five people in Twin Falls and Cassia County to take the lie detector test, Sheriff Billy Crystal said Thursday.

"We are doing polygraphs. I can't tell you who or what the results are yet. We are using them simply to eliminate certain people from being suspects, which we expect to happen," Crystal said.

Polygraph tests were conducted Thursday and will continue today, Crystal said.

The tests cannot be used in court, however. Also, Crystal said he does not expect to charge anyone as a result of polygraph findings.



Krieger

Krieger's body was found Saturday on the east bank of the Snake River 16 miles upstream from Burley. Her throat had been slashed, and she had been stabbed in the heart.

A pathologist's report said Krieger has been dead for at least 30 days when her body was found.

Krieger disappeared from her father's Burley home in late February, two days before her 15th birthday. A

lie detector trail of spotty blood led from her basement bedroom, upstairs' out the back door to a fence.

Police initially investigated the case as a runaway but now suspect she may have been murdered in her home.

Crystal said family members have not been ruled out as suspects. The field of suspects, though, goes well beyond relatives, Crystal said.

"To say that some member of the family is or is not a suspect goes beyond what we know," Crystal said. "We do not suspect any member of the family any higher than we do any of the other suspects."

Family members are not talking to the media. A press conference scheduled for Wednesday was cancelled until Krieger's body is released, said her mother Rhonda Krieger.

The Krieger family has established a reward fund for information leading to the conviction of the killer.

TWIN FALLS — The Magic Valley Symphony musicians take the stage, but the work done behind the scenes is what puts them there.

Ten years ago, local music enthusiasts Carolyn Gilbert, Marty Mead and Margaret Vincent organized the Magic Valley Symphony League. Ever since, the group has been providing support for the symphony in all sorts of ways.

"When I moved here four years ago and found out there was a symphony, I flipped," said Helen Lightner, this year's league president. "The members of the symphony league really love music."

Lightner certainly has the credentials to discuss music appreciation. A lyric soprano, she has performed four major vocal recitals in New York and has toured on stage in London, Vienna and Munich. On staff at New York University, she coordinated the school's vocal music program for 28 years. She has also published a book on voice and once served as a consultant for a company that published music textbooks.

The stage was filled with a mood — with billowing waters and "there she blows." There was talk of whale killings and there were eerie comments like, "He's the son of a cannibal king, they say."

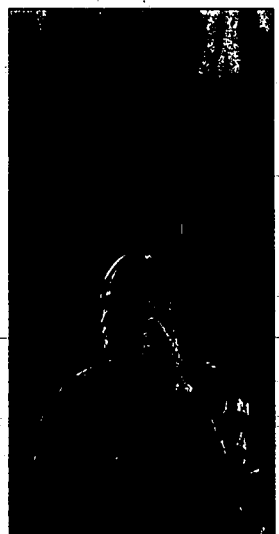
In one sequence, the members of the ship's crew raise their tin cups in a majestic toast: "Death to Moby Dick."

By itself or as a segment of Kieslowski's "Trois Couleurs" series (begun in 1993 with "Blue" and continued earlier this year with "White"), the genre-set "Red" is an eye-catching treat, a work of consummate artistry as well as near-mystical intrigue.

Forget about a foreign-film Oscar nomina-

tion (already denied the Swiss entry because of its Polish-French origins). "Red" deserves to be nominated as best picture. It's that seductive and enthralling.

Now the question is: Must I have seen "Blue" and "White" before I see "Red"? Do I need the first segments to fully enjoy the third?

Answer: It's not imperative that you see the earlier installments. "Red" co-stars Irene Jacob as a dance student-model and Jean-Louis Trintignant as a retired judge, is like the other segments, completely satisfying by itself.

...you should come prepared. As the culmination of Kieslowski's "Do we matter?" debate (inspired by the philosophy behind the French tricolor), "Red" has a resonance that can be likened to that left by the great novels of Marcel Proust and Günter Grass.

It's tragic, yet just right, denouement left me shaken and exhilarated, and convinced that here, finally, is the crowning cinematic achievement of 1994.

In contrast to the almost crystalline "Blue" and the drolly humorous "White," this one, befitting its title, is darker, more impassioned. Indeed, at three crucial junctures, Zbigniew Preisner's score explodes into a defiant bolero, signaling the antagonists to eye one another like predator and bull.

"Red," which is redolent with pain and sadness, in-in-the-end, about God's master plan for the exploited and the innocent. In its final, unforgettable scenes, it trumpets the innate goodness of man. (Knight-Ridder Newspapers)

At the outset, no one seems particularly likable or interesting. Diego (Jorge Perugorria) appears to be as shallow as he is flamboyant. David seems callow and dogmatic, and Vladimir Cruz initially gives him the unattractive intensity of a young man who has already made up his mind about most of life's big questions.

But David is vulnerable, thanks to his recent breakup, and Diego turns out to be a convincing influence. Before long, David is going to Diego's apartment not to collect evidence to betray him, but to learn from him and to explore the non-Cuban cultural influences that dominate his life.

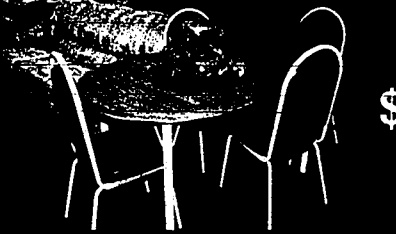

Backbeat

Belly makes noise

Don't go sniffing for friction between rock 'n' rollers Tanya Donnelly and Kristin Hersh.

There are circumstances for juicy acrimony, but if it's there, they simply won't let on. Friends since childhood and stepsisters for a time, the two musicians spent 10 years together in the Boston band Throwing Muses. But in 1992, Donnelly got tired of being second fiddle in the Muses and left to form her own group, Belly.

Belly's 1993 debut album, "Star," was a pop sensation that sold more than 800,000 copies—more than the entire Muses collection—and earned the quartet Grammy nominations for Best New Artist and Best Alternative Album.

But there's no hint of jealousy or resentment from Hersh—who, like Donnelly, is 28. "I adore her and want her to be happy," is her succinct comment. And for her part, Donnelly says she's happy to see Hersh and the Muses continuing.

What's important is that 1995 finds both bands hitting new creative peaks, each with new albums out and new tours on the road.

Belly's "King" produced by classic rock veteran Glyn Johns (the Who, Rolling Stones, Clash)—is a harder-hitting affair than "Star," retaining its predecessor's pretty melodicism but adding more raw guitars and thundering rhythms. Belly is the cover story of the latest issue of Rolling Stone.

Donnelly approached "King" with a mission: to make it more of a Belly band effort than "Star," which was really the explosion of her pent-up writing ambitions in both Belly and the Breeders, which she was a member of in its formative days. "Being a solo artist isn't a valid source of power for me,"

she explains. "As a listener, I'm attracted to bands. So it makes sense to be in a band if that's what I like to listen to."

The difficult part, she says, was getting her bandmates—bassist Gail Greenwood and brothers Tom Gorman on guitar and Chris Gorman on drums—to freely contribute their ideas. "When we first started to write together, there was a lot of shyness... like a first date or something," she says. "It took us a little while to settle into it... until we could look at each other and go 'Come on! Just play it!'"

The latest incarnation of the Muses follows Hersh's successful solo album, "Hips and Makers," with "University," the group's most focused and accessible album yet.

The Muses—Hersh, original drummer David Narcizo and new bassist Bernard Georges—had actually finished preparing the material for "University" when Hersh wrote and made rough tapes

of the songs for her solo "Hips and Makers."

In her mind, "Hips and Makers" was a private project. But when she played it for friends, including R.E.M.'s Michael Stipe, they urged her to put it out. "I couldn't imagine sitting there with a piece of wood in my lap like I do in my living room—and people would be interested in it," she says. "I guess I always thought we had to be jumping around, yelling and sweaty and drunk. I was the only drunk and sweaty one at my solo show."

But the "Hips and Makers" experience had little effect on what became "University." Hersh says the stripped-down quality of "University" comes from working with the Muses as a trio. Hersh says there are still plenty of sonic experiments, but with a "solidity"—usually provided by Narcizo's drums or Georges' bass—that keeps the songs from straying too far off the rhythmic path.

more than 300 videos, including scenes straight from Nickelodeon.

The Graphics Studio: Includes a color palette and art tools so kids can paint their own pictures or draw over existing graphic elements.

The Music Studio: Kids compose original music or re-mix over 70 pieces of music.

The Sound FX Studio: Offers more than 300 sound effects. Kids can also record their own voice or make up sound effects if their computer has microphone recording capability.

Director's Lab: Young moviemakers edit their project into a seamless multimedia video.

The Screening Room: See finished production that then can be saved on a disk.

'Circle of Friends' — A charming, if somewhat pat comedy romance set mostly in Ireland in the late '50s, starring Chris O'Donnell. It's a coming-of-age movie about three small-town girls who go to college in Dublin and redefine themselves. (PG-13, for sexual content.) (Twin Cinema)

'While You Were Sleeping' — Sandra Bullock is a lonely subway token collector who admires a man (Peter Gallagher) from afar. When he's mugged and left in a coma, she becomes his ostensible fiancée. Also starring Bill Pullman. (Twin Cinema)

'Bad Boys' — An action comedy about two mismatched Miami cops who trade identities to keep a witness happy as is loud, violent and preposterous as it sounds. While audiences will gain an increased appreciation for the comic talents of Martin Lawrence and Will Smith, they will also wonder why Hollywood can't create anything better for them. (R, intense violent action, pervasive strong language.) (Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

'The Brady Bunch Movie' — Is anyone surprised that this unquenchable TV sitcom family finally made it to the big screen? The conceit, transplanting the utopian Brady clan to today's dystopian Los Angeles, is a crafty one, and the results are successfully silly. (PG-13, racy innuendoes.) (Shoshone Showhouse)

'Don Juan DeMarco' — Marlon Brando plays a psychiatrist who enters into the fantasy of a patient, played by Johnny Depp, who thinks he's Don Juan. Both actors are fun to watch but the film is like a cut-mie "Eques" — it romanticizes the boy's delusions by making normality seem mundane. Faye Dunaway co-stars. (PG-13, for sexual content.) (Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

'Dumb and Dumber' — Jim Carrey and Jeff Daniels star as a pair of low-rentage buddies. The film abounds in potty jokes and gross-out gags, but the real joke is that grown men are actually doing this stuff. (PG-13, for off-color humor.) (Burley Theater)

'A Goofy Movie' — Disney animated feature starring Goofy and his son Max as they attempt to bond on a camping trip. They tots probably won't mind it too much; adults may approve of the little cutesy lessons tucked into the toofoolery. (G.) (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

'Jury Duty' — Pauly Shore winds up a juror on the trial of a serial killer — and stretches out deliberations so that the jury system can support him as long as possible. It would be a terrible comedy at any time, but its lame references to the Simpson trial only make it worse. With Tia Carrere and Shelley Winters. (PG-13, for crude sex-related humor.) (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley, Magic Lantern of Burley, Ace Theatre of Wendell)

'Major Payne' — Although too

familiar and predictable for adults, this Damon Wayans movie is fine for youngsters and allows Wayans to shine as the most zealous Marine imaginable, who winds up commanding a unit of junior ROTC misfits. (PG-13, for some crude humor and behavior.) (Motor-Vu Drive-in, Century Cinema of Burley, Gooding Cinema, Ace Theatre of Wendell)

'Murder!'s Wedding' — A wickedly mocking but empathetic comedy about a young woman desperate to get married. Winner of four Australian academy awards, including best picture, it features a smashing starring performance by Toni Collette as the hapless Muriel and marks a potent debut for writer-director P.J. Hogan. (R, sex-related dialogue and some sexuality.) (The Movie House of Ketchum)

'Outrage!' — Dustin Hoffman is a crusading physician trying to save the world from a killer plague in this preposterous but slam-bang action thriller that is really a B-freem with a credits. Morgan Freeman and Rene Russo co-star. (R, language.) (Twin Cinema)

'The Pebble and the Penguin' — Veteran animation producer Don Bluth's enchanting musical fantasy is a love story and high adventure turning upon a penguin mating ritual in which the male presents a female with a pebble. There are some rousing new songs by Barry Manilow and Bruce Sussman. Featuring the voices of Martin Short, James Belushi, Tim Curry and Annie Golden, all terrific. (G.) (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

'Richie Rich' — With Macaulay Culkin in a wonderful "poor little rich boy" part, this is a smart example of shiny Hollywood film-making, balancing elaborate gadgetry and simple human nature. (PG, for mild violence and language.) (Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

'Rob Roy' — A moderately involving tale of an 18th century Scottish Robin Hood whose unbending sense of honor gets him in all kinds of violent trouble. While Liam Neeson in the title role and Jessica Lange as his fiery wife are unobjectionable, the acting honors go to Tim Roth, spectacular as the villainous Archie Cunningham. 'Kiss of Death:' Caruso can act

Did David Caruso break your heart by leaving "NYPD Blue" just when you were really getting to know him?

Could you find it within yourself to forgive the errant actor if he were to do a really good job in a new movie? I mean, even if he were to keep his most famous feature covered?

If your answer is a provisional yes, check out "Kiss of Death," which opens today.

The intensity of Caruso's close-to-the-vest performance in this absorbing, brutal crime movie suggests he may have the makings of a big-screen star.

A remake of the 1947 film noir of the same name, "Kiss of Death" features our rogue redhead as Jimmy Kilmartin, a trying-to-reform car thief who just can't seem to catch a break.

No sooner does he begin to rebuild his life than his worm of a cousin shows up at his door with an offer he can't refuse.

To keep the worm from being squashed by mobsters, Jimmy agrees to serve as a driver in a crime. The whole thing is supposed to take just two hours.

Yeah, sure. And Gilligan's cruise took only three.

Of course, something goes wrong, something that brings the law down so hard that Jimmy spends the next few years trying to claw his way back. He loses just about everything — his home, his wife and a lot of his self-respect.

But he hangs onto just enough of that last item to make him worth caring about.

Directed by Barbet Schroeder ("Single White Female") from a script by Richard Price ("Sea of Love"), the new movie is probably too much of a downer to score big at the box office. Yet it isn't quite uncommercial, either.

As for Michael Rapaport ("Higher Learning"), who plays Jimmy's worm of a cousin, he's about equal portions of pathetic vulnerability and merciless opportunism.

Not an attractive combination. Caruso, however, is the movie's main selling point. And despite his character's flaws, he holds onto your sympathy.

There's something about the way this actor carries himself that says: No, I haven't always played things straight, but then you ought to see what I've been up against.

Let's give this guy another chance, shall we? (Twin Cinema)

ly hungry for friendship. Helen Hunt (TV's "Mad About You"), who plays Jimmy's wife, doesn't stick around long, but the way she smokes a cigarette tells you everything you need to know about

"Kiss of Death" is a visually bright, emotionally dark thriller that does its job efficiently and doesn't stray far from neo-noir conventions. Schroeder handles the in-your-face action expertly, but what distinguishes this movie from a lot of others is the vulnerability of the characters.

Even the most menacing of the people on the screen have sharply defined weaknesses that make them endearing — or, at least, easier to understand.

Nicolas Cage, for example, plays a pumped-up mobster with a big, scary goatee, who hangs out at strip club called Baby Cakes (where much of the film is set). Cage is certainly fierce, yet he's also painfully asthmatic and almost embarrassing.

Boston prepares to harvest Garden magic for last time

BOSTON — The Boston Celtics say goodbye to the Boston Garden on Friday night, playing their last regular-season game in an arena that is as much a part of Celtics' lore as the leprechaun and the parquet floor.

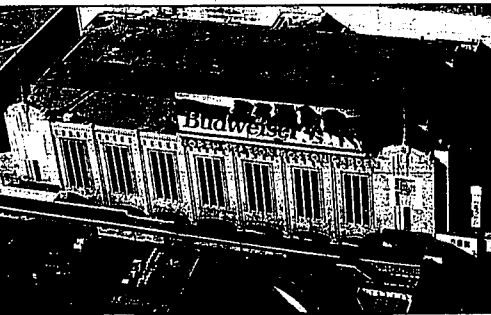
The team still is in the hunt for a playoff spot and a likely Eastern Conference matchup against the Orlando Magic, but its last definite home date is the game against the New York Knicks.

Bob Cousy, the Celtics' Hall of Fame guard, plans to be in the stands. He knows he'll have a hard time walking out the door.

“Everybody sees something different when they look at that building. I look at it and see a beautiful time of my life,” Cousy said.

During the 1946-47 season, Cousy and his Holy Cross teammates played several home games at the Garden en route to their NCAA basketball championship. Three years later, Cousy spent his wedding night playing a game for the Celtics.

And in March 1963, when Cousy played his own final regular-season game in the Garden, a moment of silence was shattered

when a fan yelled out, “We love ya, Cooz,”

Cozy, now a Celtics broadcaster, said:

“I know intellectually it has to go down, but I will shed a huge tear when it does.”

The 67-year-old Garden follows Chicago Stadium, shuttered a year ago, into oblivion. The building will be closed in September and its prime tenants, the Celtics and the NHL Boston Bruins, will move next door to the new \$160 million FleetCenter, a state-of-the-art arena much like Chicago's new United Center.

The Celtics' championship banners will be taken down from the rafters of the yellow brick building, which also has played host to Elvis Presley and the Beatles, and has been a venue for speeches by John F. Kennedy and Winston Churchill.

The FleetCenter will have an expanded seating capacity for both teams — from 14,890 to 18,400 for basketball, and from 14,448 to 17,200 for hockey. But what it will not have are the wars that gave the Garden its charm.

“With Boston, there was a sense that nobody should be in there playing basketball and that the building should have been torn down a long time ago. But it wasn't, and it became kind of a special place because it was so outdated,” U.S. Sen. Bill Bradley, D-N.J., wrote Sunday in The New York Times.

Bradley, a former Knicks forward, recalled how the Garden lacked air conditioning and the Celtics used that to their advantage.

Carolina eyes trading 1st pick in NFL draft

NEW YORK (AP) — Bill Polian should be in an enviable position. As the general manager of the Carolina Panthers, he has the first pick in Saturday's NFL draft to use or barter as he sees fit.

This year, however, it's questionable how enviable that position is. If Carolina weren't a first-year expansion team, the pick would be easy — Ki-Jana Carter, the Penn State running back who may be the best prospect at his position.



Simon G. J. Simpson. But by 2000, when Carolina will be ready to contend, Carter may be too hot to use to help after playing behind an expansion offensive line.

So Polian, who as Buffalo's GM was often at the low end of the first round, has made no move to sign Carter, waiting for someone to tempt him with extra draft picks so he can take a quarterback, preferably Kerry Collins, Carter's Penn State teammate.

So he has been talking trade with Washington and Minnesota, among others, and even his old friend Marv Levy has called from Buffalo. "I assume at this time of year, Marv didn't just want to talk about old times," Polian said Friday.

This is a draft where offensive players dominate, particularly offensive linemen, quarterbacks and tight ends. It's also a draft for teams to fill needs; free agency after four years no longer gives teams time to develop "the best available athlete."

The draft will start with an elite group.

two named K. Carter: Ki-Jana and Florida defensive end Kevin.

Michael Westbrook, and Michigan running back Tyrone Wheatley not far behind. There's also a premium on pass rushers, even undersized ones like Mike Mamula of Boston College and Hugh Douglas of Central State in Ohio, Mamula, who weighed just 237 pounds at the NFL Scouting Combine, is moving up so quickly he might be the first overall pick if the draft were held a month from now.

Yet despite the consensus that Ki-Jana Carter is No. 1, Carolina would really like to trade down and take Collins, a big, strong arm and raw quarterback, the shelf life of running backs is short, 6-8 years if injuries are avoided, while a young quarterback could learn in Carolina behind Frank Reich.

"The Panthers want to do this right," says Leigh Steinberg, the agent for both Ki-Jana Carter and Collins. "This is their first draft, they may never get this high again and they want to be able to build a foundation that will make them into a contender relatively quickly."

Cedric Maxwell, who played on the Celtics' championship teams in 1981 and 1984, said he was underwhelmed the first time he visited a building he grew to love.

"I always remember just the horror of coming in the place the first time," said Maxwell. "I came in the summer and there were no banners, no parquet and I said, 'Damn, it must just be a vacant warehouse,'" Maxwell said.

The Garden was opened on Nov. 17, 1928, but it wasn't until 18 years later, that the Celtics moved in. On Nov. 16, 1946, the Celtics — then in the Basketball Association of America — beat the Toronto Huskies 53-49 before a crowd of 5,176.

Ten seasons later, the Celtics won the first of their 16 championships. Cousy and teammates Tom Heinsohn, Bill Russell and Bill Shamrock knocked off the St. Louis Hawks 110-109 in double-overtime.

THE ACES ON BRIDGE

"The man we call a specialist today was formerly called a man with a one-trick mind."

"The odds were better than 50-50," announced South. "The diamond king rated to be with West's length; if East holds it, they have four top tricks."

Look over the play to see if you can spot a way to improve the odds for South's game.

With a vision of an overtrick, South played a low diamond from dummy, hoping to win his jack. Had West held the diamond king, another diamond finesse would provide a club discard and a welcome overtrick.

Unfortunately, East won the diamond king and began to think:

Fearing South might discard on dummy's diamond queen, East cashed his club ace in search of a signal from West. West encouraged with his nine and East led a second club to West's king. West's heart ace took the setting trick and four spades went one down.

How might have South improved his chances? He should have given up on a possible overtrick in a trade for misdefending East. When South played a low diamond from dummy to force East's king, he left East with only the option of searching for three more quick winners. Had South played a more deceptive diamond queen at trick one, East might have placed the diamond jack with West. If so, he might have returned a diamond without fear of a discard by South.

After that, South's jack would win and, after trumps are drawn,

a club loser would disappear on dummy's diamond ace. Making four spades:

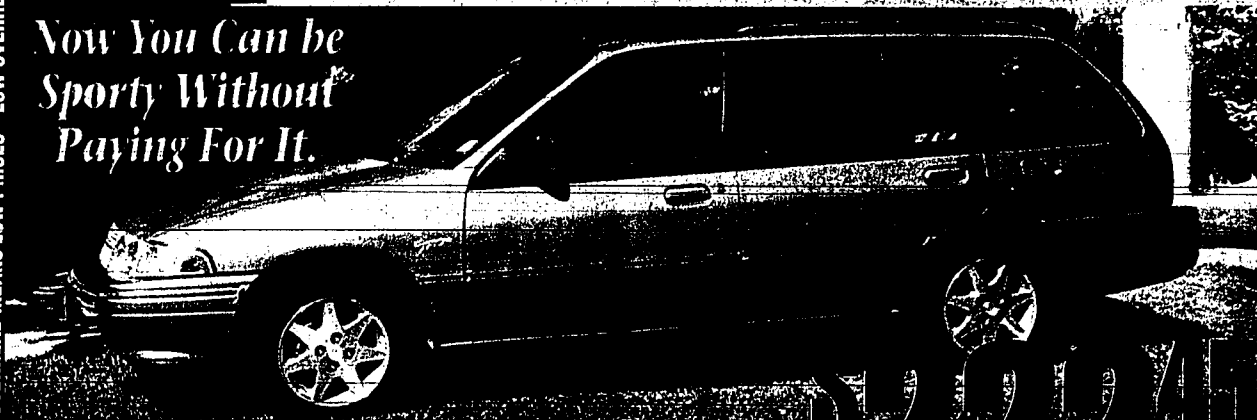

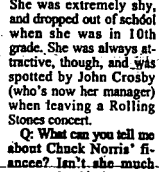

LeClerc is fast to add that he is not unhappy with his lot and enjoys doing soaps. He says it allows him to live a comfortable lifestyle and gives him time to pursue other career opportunities.

He has always kept his hand in theater, both in his native Canada and the U.S., and at the present time the actor is also functioning as a producer — he has two plays ("Celestine" and "The Visitor") that he hopes to get presented on Broadway in the near future. In Canada, he produced "The Elephant Man" and "Key Exchange," in which he also performed. He also adapted, translated and produced "Love Letters" for French-Canadian audiences.

"Live theater is still one of the most exciting acting challenges, and I have always enjoyed it. My introduction to U.S. audiences was in the Broadway production of "Dracula." That led to my being signed for "All My Children."

—LeClerc wears his French heritage with pride and recalls the advice he was given by many casting directors when he was trying to get a foothold as an actor in the U.S.: "Lose the accent." He never did, and he knows now that it would have been a mistake if he had.

"I am, who I am and it's not natural trying to blend in totally, losing your identity in the process. I remember when I first read for the part of Jeremy. The description in the script said he was tall, blond and all-American, but I got the part anyway."

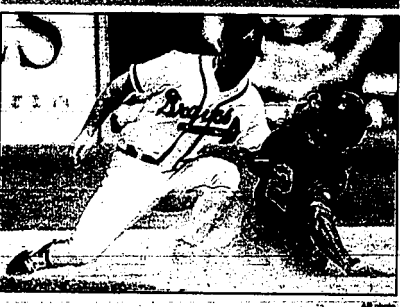

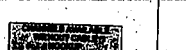
