WASHINGTON — Idaho Republican Sen. Larry Craig, an outspoken opponent of gun control for private citizens, wants to disarm some 7,000 federal officers who patrol national forests, parks and wildlife refuges. "Why is a forest ranger responsible for managing trees and wildlife and watersheds interested in packing a gun?" he said in an interview with the Associated Press Thursday.

Just last week, Forest Service employee David Jack Wheeler, 49, was shot dead in his government truck during a routine bridge inspection in the Payette National Forest, 15 miles north of Weiser. Two teenagers were charged with the killing. "But Craig, a board member of the National Rifle Association, said guns are not needed at the Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, or Fish and Wildlife Service. He said he would maintain state armed law officers at the National

Park Service because that agency "is a manager of people as much as a protector of property." Craig says people are increasingly frightened by the presence of "an armed federal entity" in the West. "There has always been a healthy suspicion of the federal agent. Now there is developing a healthy fear especially if the agent is armed," Craig said. He said Thursday there was no inconsistency in his defense of the right to bear arms at a time he was calling for disarming federal agents. "The Second Amendment applies to private citizens. We have always controlled and determined who packs a gun as a law-enforcement officer," he said. "Some of the federal employees whom Craig wants to disarm are skeptical of the idea. "It would be extremely ill advised and I think it's extremely irresponsible," said Tom Riley, of the Fish and Wildlife Service's Boise office. As

Woman dies in Buhl shooting

BUHL — A Buhl-area woman was shot to death Thursday evening, and police were searching for a man with whom she had lived for years.

Five shots were fired at 327 Clear Lakes Road from an old, small-caliber rifle during a quarrel between the man and woman, said Lt. Dick Floyd of the Buhl Police Department.

The woman died of multiple gunshot wounds. In the house with her were three children, including the victim's 5-year-old daughter, said a neighbor, Tammy Sevey.

Apparently, neither the victim nor the suspect lived at the house where the shooting occurred.

At about 5:30 a.m., a resident of the house, Terri Bennett, ran to

Severa's home and told her to call police.

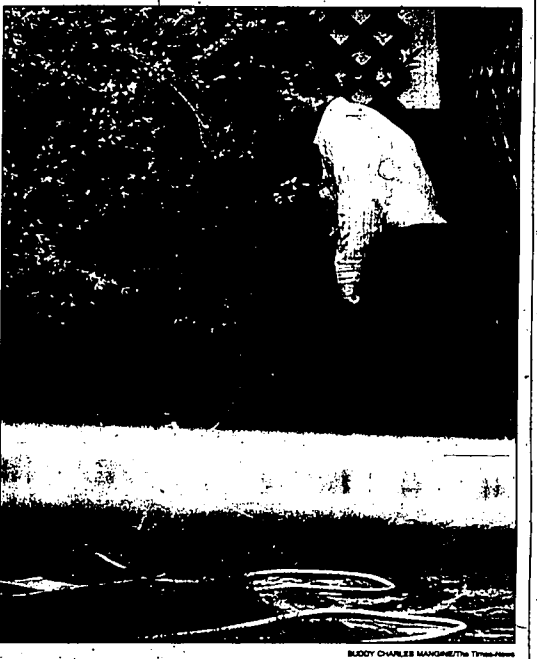
"I was shaking. I didn't even know my own address," Severa said.

Zandra Robbins, also a neighbor, said, "Two kids came over, banging on my door and said, 'A lady has been shot dead in our house.'"

Police arrived soon after, and by nightfall, the Twin Falls County prosecutor, local police and the coroner were examining the scene, including an apparent bullet hole in the front screen door.

"We should have an arrest by the morning," Floyd said.

Police were seeking for questioning a 39-year-old man described as 6 feet tall, 175 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. His dark-green station wagon had been recovered by 9 p.m., police said.

us patience, "and from Little Orphan Annie we've learned to never give up." That persistence was illustrated by Mort Walker, creator of "Beetle Bailey," and "Hi and Lois." Walker has been campaigning for a stamp honoring the comics for three decades. "They told me they couldn't use Beetle because I'm not dead," said Walker. "I told them, 'I'm working on it.'"

While some of the early comics may not be well known today, others like "Dick Tracy" and "Prince Valiant" remain popular. And the Yellow Kid became part of history by lending his name to a type of journalism. Comics fans and people nostalgic for the funnies of their youth are expected to boost sales of the set, the latest in the pop culture productions that have included Elvis Presley, Marilyn Monroe, silent movie stars and musicians. Walker said the post office probably chose Dagwood because of his long and close association with the mail.

Hunt for bombing victims concludes

OKLAHOMA CITY — Attorney General Janet Reno insisted Thursday the trail hasn't gone cold in the hunt for John Doe 2. At the bombed-out federal building, crews moved closer to giving up the search with 14 of the dead still missing. Workers began sifting through the last 6-foot pile of unsearched rubble. They planned to work through the night if necessary and then finally accept that some victims may never be found. "I had wanted to find everybody," said fire Capt. Richard Bell. "But I realize now a lot are just gone." The death toll climbed to 159, including 18 children. Once the rescuers quit, families will be allowed to gather at the site for one last, private remembrance. In Washington, Reno admitted dis-

appointment that John Doe No. 2, the second suspect in the bombing, has not been identified or taken into custody. But she said the FBI is following thousands of leads in the April 19 bombing, the deadliest domestic terrorist attack in U.S. history. The arrest and release of two drifters originally believed linked to bombing suspect Timothy McVeigh, the only person charged so far, demonstrate that "it is also important that people who are not guilty, who are not implicated, are quickly cleared as such," Reno said. "And so I'm glad that that process worked where those very unusual coincidences took place," the attorney general said. With the government offering a \$2 million reward, a hot line has gotten more than 36,000 calls, from which more than 14,800 substantive leads have been written up and sent to FBI

officers around the nation, a federal official said on condition of anonymity. Despite their release, Gary Alan Land and Robert Jacks have been subpoenaed to testify before a federal grand jury investigating the bombing. A Justice Department official said in Washington. "That was done as a precaution, said the official, who demanded anonymity. The penalties for lying to a grand jury are greater than those for lying to the FBI, and the grand jury can issue warrants to search any of the men's possessions or property, the official noted. On a sunny and warm day, about 50 firefighters worked through one last pile of rubble in the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building. "Most of the piles have been reduced to their original ground level — except this one," said fire Maj. John Long.

Senators question bill

WASHINGTON — Senators voiced skepticism Thursday about the constitutionality of key provisions of the administration's anti-terrorist bill on deporting aliens and restricting fund raising. "I am very concerned about secret deportation proceedings," said Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., chairman of the Senate Judiciary subcommittee on terrorism. Specter said some believe provisions making it a crime to raise funds, even for legal activities, for groups determined by the president to be terrorist may violate First Amendment rights. Administration officials testifying before the panel took pains to assure the senators that the proposals protected the rights of individuals. They stressed that an alien couldn't be deported for alleged terrorist connections unless the procedure was approved by the attorney general or deputy attorney general.

Simpson defense concentrates on blood in questioning chemist

LOS ANGELES (AP) — DNA test results suggest that blood under Nicole Brown Simpson's fingernails was hers, a police chemist testified Thursday, debunking a defense theory that she slayed a mysterious killer in a fight to save her life.

The assistant crime lab director Gregory Matheson testified that less-sophisticated tests he performed showed the blood was type B, which didn't match Simpson's or the victim's. "The defense tried to seize on his testimony that his results could point to another killer," said Matheson, who isn't a DNA expert and didn't perform the more sophisticated genetic testing used in prosecution questioning that the DNA test confirmed what his serological test did.

"Mr. Matheson, are you aware that the items 8A and 8B were, in fact, sent out for DNA testing and came back with the result consistent with Nicole Brown?" prosecutor Hank Goldberg asked, referring to the fingernail blood scrapings.

"That's my understanding, yes," Matheson replied.

Judge Lance Ito sustained a defense objection, but didn't tell the jury to ignore the exchange, saying,

"Well, I assume we'll get to that later. The defense is expected to challenge the DNA results."

Under rigorous cross-examination about another defense theory that Simpson was framed, Matheson testified that nearly a quarter of Simpson's blood is missing from the sample he voluntarily gave police the day after the murders.

The missing blood, he acknowledged, could have provided prosecutors with as many as 150 blood swatches of the type sent to DNA laboratories for testing.

The defense claims that the small amount of blood — estimated at 1.5

to 2 milliliters — was enough for a frame-up and could have been planted at the murder scene and Simpson's house.

Matheson testified to account for the blood, explained to jurors that some is lost every time a sample is drawn (blood is left in the tool used to transfer the blood) and every time the vial is opened (blood around the inside of the lid is wiped off).

"Do you just think it away?" Goldberg asked.

"Yes," Matheson said.

"And does that happen every time you open a blood vial?"

"It can, yes."

Ms. Simpson and Ronald Goldman were slain June 12 outside her condominium, their bodies awash in pools of blood. With no eyewitnesses or murder weapon recovered, prosecutors have relied on analysis of blood to make their case against the football star and his wife.

The defense is fighting back with its own experts, test results and scientific sleuthing. A surprise centerpiece of defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr.'s opening statement was that blood under "Mr. Simpson's nails pointed to a killer other than her ex-husband."

The defense pressed Matheson on those test results Thursday. He testified that preliminary tests showed it doesn't match Simpson's or that of either victim and that the tests could point to another killer.

But he said the type B blood might have degraded from a type that would match Ms. Simpson's BA, and more sophisticated tests — such as DNA — might produce a different result.

Asked by defense attorney Robert Blasier whether he was saying his tests were wrong, Matheson said: "I believe all my tests are accurate... I'm not stating this test is inaccurate. I'm just saying there is an alternate explanation."

The senior enforcement agent in charge of Idaho and Nevada, he oversees six other officers.

"Almost 100 percent of the people we deal with are armed, and a number of them have been drinking," said Riley, who has been a special agent for 22 years. "A number of them are involved in illegal activities, and from time to time, it becomes very contentious."

"We're like any other peace officer," added Joe Leaf, criminal investigator with Idaho's BLM state office. "Our job is to protect the public and our natural resources."

The senator has been a staunch defender of Eugene Hussey, a Lemhi County rancher, who has admitted throwing rocks at three Fish and Wildlife Service agents in March after the agents brought a federal search warrant to his ranch. A wolf had been shot dead on the property, and the agents were trying to determine whether the Endangered Species Act had been violated.

Riley was among the three Fish and Wildlife agents.

"There was a tremendous amount of restraint and a tremendous

amount of professionalism when we were talking to Mr. Hussey," Riley said Thursday.

The senator said the agencies originally asked for money to arm law enforcement officers to fight drug trafficking. "They didn't need them before and they don't need them now," he said.

"What happens in the West when all of a sudden they see these folks in the Forest Service and BLM being armed and carrying arms, they grow frightened, they go to a public hearing, and standing around the room are armed Forest Service and BLM people," Craig said Wednesday.

He cited fear growing out of such incidents as the deaths at the Branch Davidson compound near Waco, Texas, and the killing of a militant's wife and son at Ruby Ridge, Idaho.

Spokesman Bryan Wilkes said Craig has no plans to introduce legislation ending the gun war, but is reviewing the overall law enforcement organization at the Forest Service.

About 6,700 law officers carry guns. Interior Department agents, department spokesman Jamie Workman said Thursday. They include the National Park Service,

3,200; Bureau of Indian Affairs, 2,260; Fish and Wildlife Service, 1,000; BLM, 251; and Bureau of Reclamation, 14.

Forest Service spokesman Alan Polk said the agency would not respond to Craig's comments. He said approximately 680 Forest Service law enforcement law officers carry guns.

A Forest Service officer in Carson City, Nev., was bombed in March. A BLM officer in Reno, Nev., was bombed in October 1993. There were no injuries in either incident.

Gary Hompland, regional conservation officer for the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in Jerome, said he routinely works alongside armed BLM, Forest Service, and Fish and Wildlife officers — and says they need to be armed.

"We all have to work together," Hompland said. "The law enforcement community is spread pretty thin as it is. We can't be everywhere at once, and neither can they."

"When it comes to stopping lawbreakers, it shouldn't matter what kind of badge you wear or what color of shirt you have on," Hompland said.

In other developments:

- A law enforcement source said the FBI is studying videotape from an Oklahoma trooper's car to check a witness report that a brown pickup truck stopped ahead of McVeigh's car when the suspect was arrested after the bombing.
- The Dallas Morning News reported authorities were trying to enhance the image of the film, saying the truck's license plate was captured by the videotape. The camera showed the pickup pulled over when McVeigh stopped, the paper said, quoting an anonymous source.
- A Highway Patrol spokesman said he knew nothing about the tape, and the FBI refused to comment.
- In Wichita, Kan., a federal judge granted a joint request from prosecutors and defense lawyers to delay the movement of Oklahoma City bombing material witness Terrence Nichols from Wichita to Oklahoma.
- U.S. Attorney Randy Rathun said authorities expect to move Nichols sometime after May 10. The 40-year-old Herington man had been scheduled for transfer any time after noon today.
- "The delay is because we want to ensure an orderly transfer of Mr. Nichols," Rathun said, then refused further comment.
- An unidentified employee of True Value Hardware Store in Kingman, Ariz., told the FBI on Wednesday that he saw a former employee sell McVeigh two 50-pound bags of ammonium nitrate, said store manager Paul Shuffler. Ammonium nitrate and fuel were used to make the Oklahoma City bomb, and a mysterious explosion at a house outside Kingman on Feb. 21 is being investigated as a possible practice bomb.
- Shuffler said the transaction was a cash sale and there are no records. McVeigh worked at the hardware store from February to April 1994.

Once the search ends, dogs will be sent in one last time to check for bodies. The FBI, which has been going through the rubble for evidence, expects to finish its search about the same time, said spokesman Dan Vogel.

After that, federal officials in Washington will decide whether to rebuild at the site. Sentiment is strong in Oklahoma City to raise the site and put up a memorial to the victims.

"It could be kind of like the Unkown Soldier, except this one is the grave of the missing," said Mayor Ron Norick.

Federal agents moved through the shell of the building, looking for confidential files and other paperwork from the Drug Enforcement Administration, Secret Service and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

File cabinets leaned precariously on piles of rubble. Papers had been plodded drawers drifted by, sometimes briefly catching fire, from sparks as searchers used blowtorches to cut steel reinforcement bars.

Slight rise in sea level stumps researchers

WASHINGTON (AP) — A satellite has detected a sea-level rise of more than a tenth of an inch in each of the past two years, about twice that measured by land-based instruments over the last century.

Researchers said Thursday they are uncertain if this rise is caused by general warming of the Earth's climate, or if it is a short-term effect. But if the trend continues, said one expert, "it could be very, very significant."

R. Steven Nerem, a NASA scientist at Goddard Space-Flight Center in Maryland, said two years of measurements from a satellite called Topex-Poseidon have detected an average annual sea-level rise of 3.9 millimeters.

"We're pretty sure that part of the rise we see is due to El Niño (a periodic weather pattern) and part of it is due to climate change," said

Nerem. "We really can't separate the two right now."

A report on the study by Nerem is to be published Friday in the journal *Science*.

El Niño is a Pacific Ocean phenomenon in which a warm water current changes its usual pattern. This, in turn, has a global effect on the weather. Nerem said El Niño's warming of cold water could have caused a thermal expansion of water molecules that over the vast expanse of the ocean, is enough to show up as a slight rise in sea level.

Bob Cheney, a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration scientist, said the satellite measurements could give important warning of a global expansion of the sea, but that more years of data are needed. "Whether or not the sea-level rise is accelerating remains to be seen," said Cheney. "Nobody really knows at this point. If this trend persists for three to five years, it could be very, very significant."

A rise in the sea level is one of the major effects from any general warming of the global climate.

Melanoma death rate jumps

ATLANTA (AP) — The death rate of skin cancers has grown steadily.

The number of people diagnosed with melanoma rose about 4 percent a year from 1973 to 1991, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. That was faster than any other kind of cancer.

And the rate of melanoma deaths rose by 34 percent, from 1.6 per 100,000 people in 1973 to nearly 2.2 in 1992, the CDC reported. Melanoma causes about three-quarters of all deaths from skin cancer. Researchers blame the increase on the popularity of outdoor recreation and tanning.

NEW YORK (AP) — Jazz great Lionel Hampton left a hospital Thursday, five weeks after suffering a stroke, and less than two weeks before a scheduled gig in Georgia.

"Feeling good," the 87-year-old vibraphonist told reporters outside Mount Sinai Hospital, where he climbed out of a wheelchair to perform a little dance.

Poll: Americans back tough eye on terrorism

NEW YORK (AP) — Spying on suspicious groups, seizing their weapons, deporting foreign suspects — these are powers most Americans say the government should have after the Oklahoma bombing.

An Associated Press poll taken April 28 to May 7 found that 34 percent of U.S. adults believe the government must try to stop terrorists even if it intrudes on some people's rights and privacy.

Twenty-one percent say trading off rights and privacy is unacceptable, and 19 percent say it just won't work.

This tradeoff of civil liberties for public security is embraced by far more women, 64 percent, than men, 44 percent.

The poll also found that 61 percent expect this country to experience more terrorism in the year ahead.

The bombing of the federal building in Oklahoma City was followed by a rash of counter-terrorism proposals. But amid the anxiety created by stories of paramilitary extremists, many politicians urged caution about tampering with constitutional rights.

Americans usually tell pollsters the government is too intrusive. But proposals for new anti-terrorism powers get support from large majorities among the 1,009

Americans polled for the AP by ICR Survey Research Group of Media, Pa., part of AUS Consultants.

Sixty-five percent support the power to search for and seize weapons from groups that might be planning terrorism, even if the groups have not committed any crimes.

Sixty-three percent favor FBI power to infiltrate and spy on potential terrorist organizations in this country even without evidence of a crime.

Current guidelines restrict undercover operations to cases where there is strong evidence a crime has been committed or will be soon.

Civil libertarians say looser restrictions on surveillance could result in a repeat of abuses of the 1960s and '70s, when the FBI spied on and subtended some civil rights groups and kept files on members' personal habits.







Immigrants remind us to search out opportunity

What's it mean to be an American? Ask Milorad Papic.

Papic is a former Yugoslavian professor, now living in the Magic Valley. Last year, he and his family fled war in their homeland, looking for, in his words, "a peaceful place to live and work."

There is a familiar story. Trace the family tree of most Americans, and you'll find immigrants with a similar motivation. Our forebears (with the exceptions of the Native Americans who greeted Columbus and the Africans who came in the chains of slavery) fled war, persecution, famine and poverty, looking for the opportunity for a better life.

Like Papic, most of them hit the ground running. They hustled for a living and struggled to overcome the obstacles of language, culture and race. Eventually, they and their offspring thrived in a fertile climate of democracy and free enterprise, and they shared in the work and rewards of building modern-day America.

Papic was better-equipped than most immigrants. He spoke English well and had a doctorate. Even so, like earlier immigrants, he too found obstacles, including a long, discouraging job search.

But he eventually linked up with Twin Falls Businessman Robert

Hitchcock. Together, they began an international-trade venture that is off and running. This week, the Twin Falls Area Chamber of Commerce named Papic its "Minority Small Business Advocate of the Year."

Today's immigrants, like immigrants of all eras, are often subject to suspicion and resentment. Some of that is legitimate, such as the current indignation over Social Security payments to elderly immigrants who have never worked in America.

But people like Papic — chock-full of ambition and ability — are reminders of the yeasty vitality that immigrants has always brought to this country. They are an example to those of us whose families have been here for many generations.

Some of us native-borns have lost faith in the dreams of opportunity that brought our ancestors here. Some young Americans have prematurely resigned themselves to lower standards of living than their parents enjoyed. As a culture, we often shun the hard work, the perseverance and the sacrifice that are prerequisites for getting ahead.

We can learn something from Milorad Papic and other gutsy immigrants. Whatever else they may contribute to America, they stand as living lessons about the power of the possible.

Timber companies greedy

The timber industry is keeping up with its relentless push to take as much of the remaining 10 percent of our nation's forests as it can get away with. And now, what is even worse, they have swayed public opinion to their side by angling people about property rights. Watch for the big monied interests to use the property rights issues to go in and do all kinds of things that they have been trying to do for 20 years.

These people are always thinking or rather they have public relations people, to do their thinking for them: They get the news media to blame high lumber prices on environmentalists and the protection of the spotted owl (which is really protection for the whole ecosystem) while at the same time ignoring the fact that the United States sells Japan millions of our raw logs at bargain prices. The Japanese, by the way, only want the raw logs; they want the job turning that wood to lumber for their own people. They have huge oil tankers that have been converted to saw mills so that they can pick up the logs on the north Pacific Coast; and by the time they get down the coast they have lumber to send back to Japan. But this does not often get reported.

Another tactic they are using is to get around environmental laws by claiming fire damage. If they declare an emergency, they

can get in and mow down more trees. I wonder how the forests ever survived before the man came along to cut away the good wood!

But just as aggravating to me are the timber company's self-serving, greedy attitude. They not only want to cut just as the remaining forest lands but want to cut just as they can fast as they possibly can. Then there is the attitude of the loggers and their families who could care less if they are participating in destroying acres of forest land every day as long as they keep their high-paying jobs.

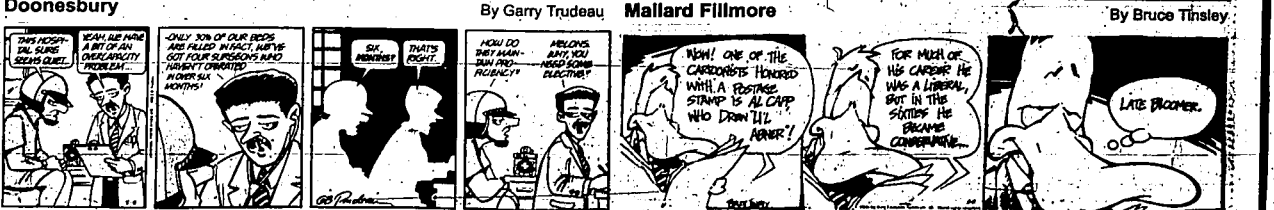

Vigil remembers Kent State shootings

KENT, Ohio (AP) — With candles and the solemn tolling of a bell, those not yet born 25 years ago and those who remember it all too well paid tribute Thursday to four Kent State University students killed during a protest against the Vietnam War.

At 12:24 p.m. that time, the precise moment of the May 4, 1970, shootings, the school's victory bell was sounded 15 times — once each for the 13 students killed and wounded at Kent and once each for two students killed at Jackson State University in Mississippi 10 days later.

Overnight, people stood vigil on each of the four spots where Bill Schroeder, Jeffrey Miller, Allison Krause and Sandy Scheuer fell after National Guardsmen opened fire on a parking lot. Hundreds of others looked on quietly.

Each of the four places was surrounded by paper cups holding candles and messages written in chalk on the pavement. "Has anything in the way of change been made? HAVE WE LEARNED?" one said.

Mary Ann Vecchio, whose moment of agony was frozen in a Pulitzer Prize-winning photograph, stood on

at the spot where Schroeder died. "Teach love. And compassion," she said in an impromptu speech. "I ask all the people who are teachers ... to

"step back, take a breath and think about it."

"And you all be smart enough to take it in," she told the students who

surrounded her, their faces lit by candlelight. "Take it home to your families, to your loved ones. Don't take it for granted."

Vecchio, then a 14-year-old runaway, was pictured kneeling with arms upraised in horror over Miller as he lay dying.

The Daily Kent Stater estimated the crowd at 1,500 at the start of the vigil; by midday, when the bell was tolled, it appeared to be at least twice as large.

Few of the 21,000 students now at Kent State had even been born on the day of the shootings. Many find it difficult — but not impossible — to understand that era.

"My parents went through it, my friends' parents went through it — some of my friends' parents were actually in the Vietnam War," said Todd Demangon, 20. "It's still kind of close. It's not completely distant."

Losi Sussini, 20, agreed. "My mom was at Ohio State when it happened and my dad was in Vietnam," she said. "I know that my mom was really upset when it happened. She told me what had happened, and I knew all about it when I came to school here."

Japan's 'devil birds' swarm around Okinawa

As the land battle raged across Okinawa, the waters around the island became littered with the shattered hulls and blood of the U.S. Navy.

Except for a few days of bad weather, the rain of death from the 'kies never let up. There seemed no end to the number of Japanese kamikaze pilots who were willing to trade their lives for a shot at an American warship. Some 600 of these human-guided missiles would be sent out in May, 1945. They would usually dive on the first warship they saw, which meant the radar picket destroyers at the edge of the American fleet.

On May 3, 1945, the destroyer Little was on duty east of Okinawa at 1843 hours when six "devil birds" roared in at her. Some dove from above while others skimmed across the water's top. Two were shot down, but the other four all hit within two minutes of each other.

The destroyer was wrecked from bow to stern and enveloped in flame and smoke. Little went down in 10 minutes, taking 30 crewmen with her. Miraculously, 280 others were rescued, though 52 were wounded. This was because the minelayer Aaron Ward and several landing craft were stationed near the destroyer in anti-



patation that she would be a target. Such escorts were known as "pallbearers" among the destroyermen.

The next day saw two more picket destroyers go down: the Luce, near where Little was lost, and the Morrison patrolling north of the island.

Luce was a fighter-director ship. When six kamikazes appeared at 0740 hours, Luce vectored orbiting Navy F6F "Hellcats" to intercept them. The Navy flyers got four of the enemy, but the other two broke through and headed for Luce. One smashed forward on the starboard side, the other into the port side near the aft engine room. The explosions showered the ship with burning gasoline and tore a fatal hole in the hull. The destroyer went down fast. The "pallbearers" moved in to rescue 186

crewman, but 149 others were lost. Morrison was sailing with destroyers Ingraham. The Navy did not have enough destroyers to double up at each post in the picket line, but this was the northernmost point and thus extremely vulnerable. The kamikazes came for Morrison shortly after Luce went down. The defending Marine Corps F4U "Corsair" fighters, roared in to protect the line.

Again, the enemy came in a group of six. The Marines got two, but the others dove through the anti-aircraft fire of the destroyers. In quick succession, all four slammed into Morrison. At least two of the suicides were carrying bombs which blew the destroyer apart. Out of a crew of 331, 152 were killed and 108 wounded.

Not all the ships lost went down immediately. Many limped away only to be declared beyond repair. One such case was destroyer escort Oberrender, hit by a single kamikaze while on anti-submarine patrol. The enemy plane was ridden by the anti-aircraft gunners, but momentum carried its 500-lb. bomb forward into the DE, causing heavy internal damage. However, only eight crewmen were killed, and a tug towed Oberrender to Kerama Rinto, a harbor that was filling up with Okinawa casualties. Here it was determined

that the DE had fought its last battle.

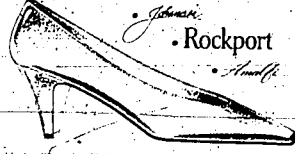
Two more destroyers were sunk during the month. Longshaw was providing fire support for the troops ashore when it ran aground on Oae Reef the morning of May 18. Not even the use of a tug could get the DE free. She was spotted by Japanese artillery and was soon under a murderous barrage. Unable to move or target the enemy guns on shore, Longshaw was shot to pieces. The destroyer was abandoned under fire. The captain and 75 other crewmen were killed.

On May 28, the "devil bird" claimed destroyer Drexler, southwest of Okinawa. As usual, the suicide squad numbered six. Two were shot down, two more missed the ship — and two hit. The ship sank in less than a minute after the "second hit," taking 166 crewmen under.

During this month, eight other destroyers and two more destroyer escorts were damaged by kamikaze strikes. The island campaigns of the Pacific had often taken a heavy toll among the ground troops; but at Okinawa, it was the Navy that was suffering the highest death toll.

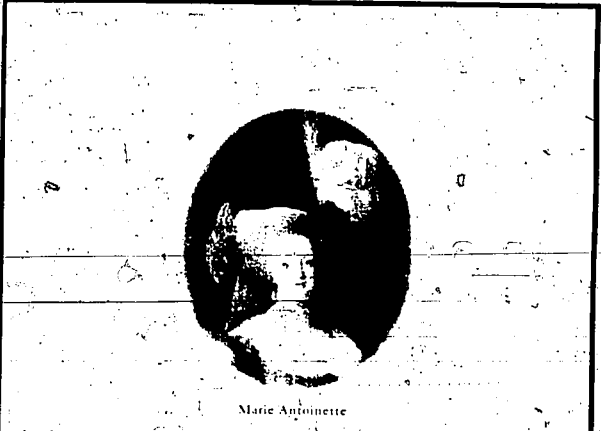

Wives visit prison; Iraq silent on appeal

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — The wives of two American prisoners visited them in jail Thursday, but there was no Iraqi response to an appeal from Washington to free the men on medical grounds.

For the first time, however, Iraqi media reported that William Barloon, 39, of Jacksonville, Fla., and David Daliberti, 41, of New Hampton, Iowa, have been allowed to see their husbands in the Bab el newspaper, run by Saddam Hussein's eldest son, Oudai.

Barloon and Daliberti were arrested March 13 after they crossed into Iraq from Kuwait, where they worked for U.S. defense contractors. They were convicted March 25 and given eight-year prison sentences despite their appeals.

The State Department said Wednesday that Barloon and Daliberti have medical problems that require their release on humanitarian grounds.

Daliberti was known to have a heart ailment. This week, Barloon was treated for sharp chest pains with nitroglycerin tablets and oxygen, and given electrocardiogram

tests that disclosed possible scar tissue, the State Department said in Washington.

The prisoners' wives, who arrived in Baghdad Saturday to plead for their husbands' release, told Cable News Network after Thursday's visit that Barloon felt stabbing pains in his chest Monday night and was taken to the prison clinic, where he was given an electrocardiogram.

On Tuesday morning, Barloon did not have any pain when his wife, Linda, came to see him, but after lunch he felt dizzy. His condition worsened and prison doctors granted Mrs. Barloon's request that he be taken to an outside hospital.

Daliberti was allowed to go along to the Baghdad hospital, where he was tested as well. Both men were returned to the prison Wednesday.

In Baghdad, Information Minister Hamed Yousef Humadi has said only one of the two men had been ill and had now recovered.

He said Mrs. Barloon and Kathy Daliberti can "visit the prisoners any time" as long as the women remain in Baghdad.

Russian veterans lose privileges

MOSCOW (AP) — For months, Anatoly Balandin has been showered with unfulfilled government promises of money, commemorative medals and champagne.

The 74-year-old World War II veteran couldn't be happier.

"I don't expect anything but adjusting his well-worn jacket covered in Red Army medals, waiting for a veteran's discount store in Moscow to open.

"I haven't felt this proud since we came back from Germany," Balandin said as Russia prepares to celebrate the

50th anniversary of the victory over the Nazis, all eyes are turning to those who helped make the victory possible — its veterans.

Many of Russia's some 3 million veterans think it's about time.

In 1945, they were venerated for their role in what Russians still call the Great Patriotic War.

But with the fall of the Soviet Union, these aging veterans lost many of the minor privileges they enjoyed under Communist rule, free movie tickets, special queues and stores offering annual discounts.

In recent years they have felt

deserted, struggling to survive on pensions that now average \$23 a month. Amid the gloom of modern Russia, the government is seizing on the anniversary as a way to make people feel good about their country and proud of its past.

Veterans are seeing their feats praised on billboards, shop windows and in radio tributes. Passersby notice medal-covered chests and congratulate veterans on the upcoming anniversary.

Dozens of world leaders are coming to Moscow to watch 10,000 veterans march in two parades May 9.

U.S. experts blow up big radar tower

SKRUNDA, Latvia (AP) — Locals called it "The Monster" — a 230-foot radar tower reinforced with 1,000 concrete blocks and 8,000 tons of steel intended to withstand the heaviest enemy fire.

But it took American demolition experts just seconds on Thursday to destroy "The Monster" and, with it, a symbol of 50 years of hated Soviet occupation of this small Baltic nation.

"When the dust cleared, all that was left was a huge heap of shattered concrete and twisted metal. Cheers went up from the tens of thousands of people who had spilled onto surrounding fields, and roads for the early-morning spectacle. Many more watched the demolition live on television.

Champagne flowed, rock music blared and fireworks lit up the sky.

"Let green grass, the color of hope, start to grow over the ruins of this monster," said President Guntis Ulmanis. "It has always been a symbol of war, occupation and global confrontation."

Washington paid almost all the \$7 million bill for the demolition, an opportunity to take out what was to have been a key component of the Soviet defense system.

Marchers protest

KATMANDU, Nepal (AP) — Riot police swinging bamboo canes dispersed a crowd of rock-throwing radicals protesting price hikes and the economic policies of the new Communist government Thursday.

No injuries were reported, but 100 demonstrators were arrested.

Day of prayer

Elected officials, others ask for guidance, assistance

TWIN FALLS — Local elected officials showcased their Christian faith at a noon-time revival Thursday on the front steps of the county courthouse.

A congregation of almost 100 residents joined in the county's observance of a National Day of Prayer, shouting hallelujahs and murmuring individual prayers while county Sheriff Wayne Touseley read Bible scriptures aloud and county Commissioner Brent Reinke begged the gathered to teach their children the difference between right and wrong.

Reinke, a Filer Republican, acted as master of ceremonies for the 45-minute service. He asked for help in dealing with juvenile crime and implored those in attendance to raise their kids right. "I pray for every one of you to take back your neighborhoods and live for the Lord," he said.

Touseley prayed for the safety of his fellow police officers and asked God "to make your job who would be morally fit to do that job."

Twin Falls Mayor Gale Kleinkopf proclaimed Thursday to be a day "to join hands and hearts with other believers in our community and throughout the country."

Local ministers also offered prayers for the nation and for the community.

"This nation was intended to be a nation of Christians," said Pastor Vern Bishop, who leads the Living Waters Christian Community in Twin Falls. He said he hoped "that (the nation) would truly be Christ-like" and asked for guidance from Jesus Christ.

"Without you we are headed on a path to destruction, but with you there is nothing impossible," Bishop said. "Smile on us, Lord. Not because we deserve it, but because we desperately need it."

Pastor Jim Sommer of Twin Falls' Christian Center of Magic Valley led public prayers on behalf of state officials and made special mention of Anne Fox, state schools superintendent. Sommer said Fox's administration "seems to be in disarray—and needs the Lord's guidance."

"We ask now that whole department be lifted up by your hand," Sommer said. The Rev. Jim Hicks, Christian education director at the First Assembly of God Church in Twin Falls, preached against what he saw as negative societal influences, including the media. He told the crowd to replace those influences with faith and hope in God.

"Regardless of the blackness of the media... there is a new light that wants to shine," he said.

The service intrigued county Commissioner Dennis Maughan, a Twin Falls Democrat who grew up in a Mormon family.

"I thought it was a national day of prayer for all," Maughan said. "I kind of took on a Christian overtone. Well, 'kind of' is an understatement."

He said he enjoyed the service but was surprised that, in this day and age, no one showed up to protest.

The U.S. Constitution allows citizens to exercise their religious beliefs but prohibits government from establishing a particular religion. Reinke said Congress set the first Thursday in May as a national day for prayer in the 1950s.

Reinke, a member of the Twin Falls Reformed Church, was impressed with the turnout at Thursday's service, which he said was put together by a local ministerial association.

He said county residents are free to conduct services at the courthouse as long as they occur outside and do not detract from county business.

"They can do that because that's their building," he said.

Gene Lawley, a Jerome resident and member of the Tyler Street Baptist Church in Twin Falls, said he was glad to see city and county leaders at the courthouse service.

Lawley said he is concerned that the nation's sense of morality has slipped during the last few decades.

"We need to pray now that our nation will turn back to God," said Susan Sharp, a Filer resident who attends services at the Christian Center of Magic Valley.

State funds aquifer recharging project

TWIN FALLS — With state money as incentive, canal companies from Jerome to St. Anthony are diverting water onto porous land in an effort to recharge southern Idaho's enormous Eastern-Snake River Plain Aquifer.

"We've got half a dozen different canal companies near Idaho Falls that are doing it," said Lyle Swank, of the Idaho Department of Water Resources office in Idaho Falls.

Magic Valley participants include the North Side Canal Co. and the American Falls Reservoir District No. 2, which transports water through the Milner-Gooding Canal.

The Idaho Water Resource Board has \$281,171 of state money to spend for up to 295,312 acre-feet of water from the Idaho water bank. One acre-foot is enough to

cover an acre with one foot of water, or 325,850 gallons.

The board also has the authority to pay \$73,828 for canal companies and irrigation districts to deliver the water to aquifer-recharge sites.

The money must be spent by June 30, at which point any leftover money will revert to the state's general fund.

Aquifer recharge is a big job, but the idea is to reverse the trend of falling water tables. By increasing groundwater supply,

water managers are hoping spring flows will increase and conflicts between water users will diminish.

Water Resource Board Chairman Clarence Parr, of Heyburn, said there are rules about who gets paid — and who doesn't — for aquifer recharge.

"We're insisting that they have a measuring device at the point they put it into the ground," he said, "and we're also insisting that they do something that they do not ordinarily do."

"They're not going to get paid for incidental recharge that's going to happen anyway," said Parr, who spent Wednesday and most of Thursday inspecting recharge sites in eastern Idaho.

The North Side Canal Co. delivered water for aquifer recharge from March 7 to April 3, said Dennis Heaps, assistant manager. A total of 13,000 acre-feet was allowed to sink in at four recharge sites, he said.

Faulty Gooding jail lock may have aided escape

GOODING — Police were looking Thursday afternoon for a multi-tattooed inmate who escaped overnight from the Gooding County Jail.

Christopher Grammer, 36, of Harman, may have manipulated a faulty door lock on his jail cell to flee sometime between 10 p.m. Wednesday and 1 a.m. Thursday, said Gooding

County Sheriff Jim Jax. Grammer, who was awaiting trial for felony aggravated assault, misdemeanor battery and misdemeanor resisting a police officer, stuffed his clothes under his cot blanket to make it appear he was sleeping, then somehow got past the jailer on duty, Jax said.

Grammer stole a 1992 GMC white and blue pickup after he fled broke into the Gooding Junior High School and stole a

maroon sweat suit, then drove to his girlfriend's house in Harman, Jax said. She sent him away at 4 a.m., and he hasn't been seen since, he said.

Grammer had been in jail for failing to appear in court on the assault charge, according to court documents from the Gooding County 5th District Court.

Bombing probe hits Boise man

TWIN FALLS — A Boise State University biochemistry student is telling the FBI — and the media — that he played no role in the bombing of an Oklahoma City federal building April 19.

Former National White Resistance Movement leader Michael J. Palasch, 28, was picked up by North Boise police by gun-toting FBI agents on April 21 barely 48 hours after a terrorist attack leveled the A.P. Murrah Building, killing more than 150 people.

Palasch said he was questioned for an hour about the bombing and was ordered not to leave the country. Thursday, FBI Special Agent Mike Dillon confirmed the encounter, but said he's prohibited from discussing the case in detail.

"All I can tell you is that Palasch was interviewed and released," Dillon told The Times-News.

Palasch, who moved to Boise from New Orleans three years ago, says he's unfamiliar with the men who orchestrated the Oklahoma City murders. "I don't know who these guys are, and I didn't have anything to do with it," he said Thursday.

The white separatist says the federal government is "collapsing," but is still tough enough to catch domestic terrorists. "It wouldn't be me (bombing federal buildings) because I'm smart enough to see that I won't be going to jail for a bombing like this, you're not going to get away with it. Not at this point. The U.S. government is way too strong, way too powerful," Palasch added.

The television pictures from Oklahoma City showed Palasch, especially pictures of bloodied kids. The father of a 2-year-old, Palasch questions why the government would put children in harm's way.

The government says the federal government was doing putting a day-care center in a federal building when they're constantly under attack," Palasch wonders. The fed, he says, "are always a target."

The government says he's a member of the blame for April 19, Palasch suggests. "The federal government acts like they're completely innocent. It's their whole thing, and people are coming to their rescue like they don't bring it on themselves," he added.

Palasch used to preach "white resistance" on talk shows and at right-wing rallies nationwide. His bodyguard busted Gerald Rivers, now on a chat during one contentious talk show, and he was arrested a couple of times for his activism.

Palasch also worked to elect former Ku Klux Klan leader David Duke to the Louisiana Legislature back in 1988.

But he says he's "burned out" on politics — at least for now. Going to class, raising a family, planning, possibly, for graduate school: these are his priorities now.

He does keep track of politics back East, back in what he calls "the control center of the United States." But he's happy in "safe and isolated" Idaho.

"You know, I love Idaho. I think the people here are a lot better than I am. A lot of Louisiana," Palasch added.

Water upstream of Milner Dam records 3/4 capacity

BURLEY — The reservoir system upstream of Milner Dam is three-quarters full.

On May 1, more than 3.12 million acre-feet of water was stored in the Upper Snake River reservoir system, according to the Bureau of Reclamation. An acre-foot is enough to cover an acre with one foot of water — or 325,850 gallons.

The system's capacity is 4.16 million acre-feet, so there's still room for another million acre-feet of water. Forecasters have predicted the system will fill as winter snows melt in the mountains of eastern Idaho and western Wyoming.

American Falls Reservoir — the system's largest at 1.67 million acre-feet — was 99 percent full on May 1.

Palisades Reservoir, which can hold 1.2 million acre-feet, was 51 percent full. Jackson Lake Reservoir, which can hold 847,000 acre-feet, was 54 percent full.

Paul, are part of the group.

Senate Finance Chairman Atwell Parry, R-Melba, and Vice Chairman Jerry Thorne, R-Nampa — both of whom backed an unsuccessful attempt in the budget committee to create an independent engineering school at Boise State University — also signed the letter endorsing Zinser.

It says her significant accomplishments include: • \$37 million worth of campus construction projects • Nearly doubling private fundraising to \$9 million. • Doubling outside research funding to \$60 million.

• Winning accreditation for the business school. • Fully implementing the electrical engineering program in Boise with plans to implement civil and mechanical engineering programs during the next year.

• Significantly improving academic progress and graduation rates of student athletes.

"The ill-advised petition calling for her non-renewal is irresponsible and frivolous. It contains no substantive information which

would, in any way, justify her non-renewal," reads the letter, which was obtained through the state open records law.

Zinser's drive aimed at persuading the Board of Education not to renew Zinser's contract for the coming year has attracted about 1,000 signatures and will be presented to the board in May, said Boise lawyer Mack Redford, a member of the UI Foundation board of directors.

"We aren't going to make a big deal of it," he said in a recent interview. "We will let the petitions and names speak for themselves."

Zinser, who is a finalist for the presidency at West Virginia University and for chancellor at the University of Kentucky, said she got a copy of the letter Tuesday and was pleased with the support.

She confirmed that she has hired a Philadelphia attorney to work on contractual issues.

She said the lawyer will serve as a financial adviser as she considers moving from one school to another.

McCammion uneasy

until rape suspect jailed

MCCAMMION (AP) — McCammion residents felt under siege until a daylong manhunt resulted in the arrest of an accused rapist.

Donald Bush, 44, is charged with two counts of battery with intent to commit a serious felony, one count of lewd and lascivious conduct with a minor, one count of an infamous crime against nature and one count of burglary.

He had been released from a Wyoming halfway house to attend his mother's funeral in Oregon, Bannock County Undersheriff Lonni Nielsen said.

A suspect broke into a home and sexually assaulted a 15-year-old boy and tried to rape the boy's mother, Nielsen said. The boy escaped, drove to a truck stop and called police.

Bush had lived in McCammion about five years ago as a tenant of the victims and apparently thought the old McCammion Bridge was

still there, Nielsen said. His car fell from the canyon and he fled into McCammion to contact people he knew.

Teachers kept students inside all school day, merchants showed pictures of the suspect and residents patrolled their town.

"We were just one step behind him all day," Nielsen said-of-the-suspect.

Mike Peace found a broken windowed in his garage Wednesday evening, saw wet clothing on the floor and someone sleeping in a cot in the rafters, Nielsen said. Bush was arrested without incident.

He was taken to Bannock Regional Medical Center where he was treated for broken ribs.

McCammion residents say the crime has changed their sense of security. "I am devastated that some of our people were subjected to that kind of thing," Mayor Martell Ginter said.

White supremacist's purchase of land alarms rights advocates

SANDPOINT (AP) — White supremacist Louis Beam's purchase of property in northern Idaho has started speculation about a possible changing of the guard in the Aryan Nations.

Beam, an ambassador for the Aryan Nations and former grand dragon of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in Texas, recently bought 15 acres, 10 miles east of Sandpoint. He is applying for permits to build a home on the property.

Efforts to reach Beam were unsuccessful Thursday.

Bonner County Sheriff Chip Roos and others wonder if Beam is preparing to take control of the Aryan Nations, based 40 miles to the south near Coeur d'Alene. Leader Richard Butler is

in his 70s and said to be in poor health.

The Beam property is about halfway between the Aryan Nations compound and the Militia now.

"It's easy to recognize that when you're going to many radical elements going on, this is probably a dandy place for him to be right now."

Beam, now 48, first Butte was acquitted of a seditious conspiracy in 1988 in a federal trial in Fort Smith, Ark. They were accused of plotting to overthrow the U.S. government and establish an all-white state in the Northwest.

A local Human Rights Task Force is concerned about Beam's arrival in northern Idaho.

"It's time to stand up and speak out about these people," said Brenda Hammond, president of the task force.

"If we are too afraid to do so, then fear and hate has us by the throat."

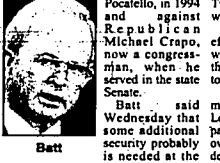
Batt may let legislators take lead

BOISE (AP) — While he will cooperate, Gov. Phil Batt may let legislators take the lead in studying whether the Statehouse needs more security.

Legislative leaders said last week that they would ask Batt to form a task force to study whether the historic structure should have more protection.

They said the move was not prompted by the bombing of Oklahoma City's federal building, the bombing's possible tie to militias, some of which are active in Idaho.

Instead, it was part of an ongoing concern about when two lawmakers makers became targets of death threats. Threats were made against then-Sen. Mary Ellen Lloyd, D-

Pocatello, in 1994 and against Rep. Bill Crapo, now a congressman, when he served in the state Senate.

Batt said Wednesday that some additional security probably is needed at the Capitol, but that he wants to take a cautious approach toward limiting public access.

"I guess I would tend to say we don't want to overreach," Batt said.

Legislative leaders have not discussed the issue with Batt, but Senate President Pro Tem Jerry

Twigg, R-Blackfoot, said the study will proceed.

"It's going to be a cooperative effort anyway, and if the governor would like us to take the lead on it, then we would certainly be willing to do that," Twigg said.

The Capitol houses Batt's offices, many elected officials and the Legislature itself. Uniformed guards patrol the structure, but there are few overt signs of security, such as metal detectors.

Except for the second floor, which contains the governor's offices, the Legislature oversees management of the Statehouse.

The study would be limited to the Capitol, but Twigg said its findings might set a standard for other state buildings.

Preston officials want leak fixed

PRESTON (AP) — City officials at Preston agree there's a need to find the source of underground petroleum seeping into the city's storm drainage system, but say there's no need to panic over the problem.

The environmental officials checked homes and businesses Wednesday, but detected no serious concentrations of gasoline fumes.

The survey came after a monitoring well disclosed eight inches of gasoline on April 27.

Officials think the source is one or more leaking underground petroleum storage tanks, but they don't know where the gasoline is coming from.

City Foreman Jan Seamon said he is willing to help pump the

gasoline, but Preston Mayor Walter Ross is hesitant to get involved until the Division of Environmental Quality provides a concrete plan of action.

"We're waiting for their recommendation," Ross said. "But we have to do something every day."

Ross said explosive vapor levels haven't been detected yet, and he urged people not to panic.

"We want to solve this problem without inciting the town about being blown up," he said. "If people need to be (warned) they should be, but I don't know what we can do about it."

Air-quality checks at several homes and businesses didn't show

dangerous amounts of fumes, but state specialist Scott Simonson said that changed overnight.

Simonson hoped to find the city's chronic underground gasoline contamination lessened this spring, after measurements last summer were promising.

Simonson's tests this week showed gasoline throughout the east side of the drainage system.

Jon and Linda Hyde, who own the home nearest the drainage outlet, have had repeated problems with gasoline fumes being forced up through pipes in their home.

Jon Hyde knows better than to wait his carefully sculpted lawn with anything but culinary water. The previous owner of his home inadvertently killed off his garden by piping drain runoff onto it.

Jerome tackles juvenile crime

JEROME — Parents need to listen to and spend more with their children if they want them stay out of trouble, juvenile and law enforcement officials say.

Many juvenile offenders feel that no one is interested in them and their self-esteem suffers, 5th District Magistrate Jack Vann said during a recent town hall meeting in Jerome.

Jerome's second town hall meeting assembled last month to discuss the increasing juvenile crime rate in the Magic Valley.

"We have all the crimes that a big city has, but on a smaller scale," Jerome County Sheriff George Silver said.

Crime has increased as the population has grown in Jerome County and the cost is rising as well. The county spends \$100 a day to house each juvenile offender. Jerome houses 12 offenders at \$36,000 a month.

The panel agreed that the place to start is in the home.

Alcohol and drug abuse are major factors in juvenile crime, said Pam Puffer, the Jerome juvenile probation officer. About 65 of the 70 youths in her caseload are influenced by alcohol abuse either within the family or by themselves.

"Some parents want the school or the judicial system to parent their children for them, she said.

Part of the problem is that families have become isolated within the community, said Dr. Tom Atkin, a clinical psychologist from Twin Falls. Children once learned society's morals and values from extended family and friends. Many now absorb their values from peers on the street.

The panel of experts agreed that the community as well as the family

has a stake in raising Jerome's children. Counseling for juvenile offenders and education for parents is available in Jerome and the Magic Valley.

Puffer has set up a, individual and group counseling program for juvenile offenders modeled on a program from the state Department of Health and Welfare's Youth Services Center in St. Anthony's.

She has also spearheaded a panel of adult volunteers from the community with the testimony of first-time offenders, and their parents. Together they come up with a workable solution.

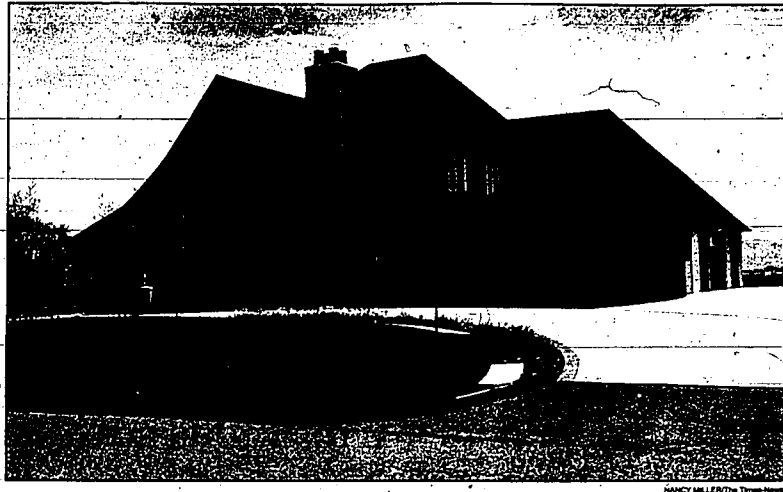
The county also offers Youth Court, the Detour Program, parenting classes and counseling, Puffer said.

Jerome High School counselor Barbara Mechem encourages students and parents to contact her at Jerome High School if a problem arises. The school offers peer counseling, individual counseling and the Impact Program, she said.

Before the community can solve juvenile problems related to drug and alcohol abuse, adults need to look at their own consumption, said J.C. Smith, an outreach worker at the Walker Center. The Magic Valley has several programs that help with this process, he said.

The next town hall meeting, in June, will cover juvenile and adult delinquent facilities. The public is welcome.

Idaho sues telemarketer

BOISE — The state consumer protection agency says it has received complaints that a New Jersey telemarketer sent unordered shipments of a septic tank cleaner, then became abusive to get them.

Attorney General Alan Lance said Thursday his Consumer Protection Agency filed a lawsuit against Miller-Plante Inc., a New Jersey telemarketer, and company president Jerry Plante. It alleges violations of Idaho's Consumer Protection Act and the state Telephone Solicitation Act.

Lance said an investigation was launched after numerous complaints that Miller-Plante telephoned Idaho consumers or used direct mail to solicit sales. Despite customers refusal to order the product, or agreement to take only a small sample, the company shipped large quantities and sent a bill, the complaint said.

Lance said the complaint alleges the telemarketer contacted consumers and harass and intimidated them through foul and abusive language to send payment for the unordered good.

Hiker dies after fall in Utah

PROVO, Utah — A hiker who witnesses said fell several hundred feet was found dead in Rock Canyon Thursday afternoon.

A mountain rescue team was dispatched to the north face of the canyon east of Provo after police received a call about 1:19 p.m. that a hiker had fallen.

Provo police Lt. Greg Duval said the man was declared dead at the scene and his body transported to Utah Valley Regional Medical Center.

The man was a Mormon missionary from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' Missionary Training Center in Provo, Duval said. A statement from church spokesman Don LeFevre identified the man as Vaikona Uluvalu Tuifua, 19, a native of Tonga

Cleanup plan could save billion

WASHINGTON — State and federal regulators have agreed to a new cleanup strategy at the Hanford nuclear reservation that will save taxpayers \$1 billion without cutting corners on health and safety, an assistant energy secretary said Thursday.

"This is a major change in the way we do business at Hanford," Assistant Energy Secretary Thomas Grumbly said.

The U.S. Energy Department, Environmental Protection Agency and state of Washington agreed to the strategy within the confines of their existing Tri-Party Agreement, said Grumbly, assistant secretary for environmental management.

"We're not going to close the park," Gregg said. "The park will still be there. It will have the same services, just managed differently."

A 1993 General Accounting Office audit of Bureau-run parks said the agency could not afford to pay for their operation and maintenance, Gregg said. The report recommended that at least half of those costs need to be cut, he said.

The GAO is an investigative arm of Congress.

Maintaining the 21-acre park, which offers boating and bank fishing access to Lake Wolcott, picnic shelters, a playground and camp sites, costs the Bureau more than \$300,000 in labor and materials.

According to Bureau figures, 40,000 people visited Wolcott Park last year.

The Bureau will begin taking proposals from private and public enterprises interested in maintaining

the park soon, said Harold Short, a Bureau land real estate specialist in Burley. Proposals will be reviewed by the Bureau with preference given to public entities, he said.

"It would be a real asset to the state parks to step in and run" Wolcott Park, Short said.

Rupert Mayor Dwinelle Allred agreed.

"I am a strong supporter of the Idaho State Parks and Recreation taking over and administering that park. I think that would give us the right people with the right experience to manage it," Allred said.

Allred said the Rupert City Council is drafting a letter supporting efforts to keep Wolcott Park publicly maintained.

State Sen. Dean Cameron, R-Rupert, has asked the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation to assume maintenance and operation responsibilities at Wolcott, he said.

representatives, has been formed to research funding possibilities for the state.

Park maintenance will cost the state an estimated \$60,000, Cameron said. The Bureau has agreed to phase-in a state-run operation program, if Parks and Recreation agrees to take over maintenance, Cameron said.

Wolcott Park was operated by the Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation in the 1950s, Short said.

The Bureau began maintaining the park again in 1976, he said. Since then, the Bureau has spent over \$3 million developing the park. Locally, \$800,000 in labor and materials has been donated.

"A lot of work was done through local help," Short said. "There's not much that was there prior to that."

Wolcott Park is 11 miles north-west of Rupert next to the Minidoka Dam. The park includes the Minidoka National Wildlife Refuge, created by President Theodore Roosevelt in 1909.

Investigators eye safety in deadly cave-in

MOSCOW (AP) — Occupational safety officials are investigating a Moscow construction accident to see if a lack of safety measures caused the deaths of two men.

A 14-foot-deep hole collapsed on Jack Robinson on Wednesday morning, John Moore yelled for help and jumped in to save Robinson only to be buried when the hole collapsed a second time. Moore was building a house and hired Robinson and his crew to install the sewer system.

"When the hole collapsed, the loose fill around the foundation flowed in, burying both men. At one point, four backhoes were used to search for Robinson. Braces or hydraulic jacks are required for all excavations deeper than five feet, but the only shoring methods in evidence Wednesday were the plywood boards and two-by-fours emergency crews installed while searching for the men."

Eugene Ballet Company brings 'Alice' to life

"A boat, beneath a sunny sky,
"Lingering onward dreamily

TWIN FALLS — Lewis Carroll intended his story to be told to his little companions, Alice Liddell and her two sisters, while they were boating on the Thames River.

"Children three that nestle near,
"Eager eyes and willing ears,
"Pleased a simple tale to hear ..."

Because of his stammer, Carroll found it easier to communicate with children. He often entertained all the children of his town; but he favored Alice, the daughter of the dean of Christ Church and the main character in the "Alice" adventures.

"Still she haunts me, phantomwise,
"Alice moving under skies
"Never seen by waking eyes."

The Boise-based Eugene Ballet Company uses this scene as an introduction, to the rest of its production of "Alice in Wonderland."

"The ballet is based on the Lewis Carroll tales, in some ways fairly closely, in other ways not," said Toni Pimble, artistic director for the company, in a phone interview from Flagstaff, Ariz. "You can't do dialogue in ballet, and much of the book is based on dialogue."

But the EBC does include multimedia special effects and narration not normally seen in ballets.

The narration consists of Carroll's poetry set to music. Pimble described this as the "fun thing" about the ballet.

"Not only do the children love this, but so do adults," she said. "It's a family show."

The EBC uses the special effects to define the mystical

Carroll privately published his first volume of "Alice" for Alice Liddell. It included his own "crude but distinctive drawings." When Carroll revised the book for widespread publication, he commissioned magazine cartoonist John Tenniel to illustrate the book.

The EBC's costumes are based on the Tenniel illustrations, as interpreted by costume designer Lynn Bowser.

EBC soloist Yvona Carr, also adds to the atmosphere of Carroll's story. She is said to bear an uncanny resemblance to the original Alice and to possess child-like qualities.

The music of "Alice in Wonderland" consists of lively English folk songs which call forth the Victorian countryside.

"You just can't get any more English (sounding) than English folk music," Pimble said. "It's English."

The EBC's Twin Falls performance will feature two other short ballets, along with the 50-minute "Alice." These are "May Dances" and the pas de trois from "Swan Lake."

Pimble chooses the ballets, and "Alice" has been performed by the EBC before.

"I chose it because of the great demand for it," Pimble said.

It's a popular tale, even though there is no evidence that Carroll's book contains the hidden political, religious or psychological messages that some have attributed to it.

Carroll, himself, described his work as "simply a new type of fairy-tale." He sent his heroine straight down a rabbit-hole to begin with, he once said, without "the least idea what was to happen afterward."

"Thus grew the tale of Wonderland,
"Thus slowly, one by one,
"Its quaint events were hammered out
"And now the tale is done,
"And home we steer, a merry crew,
"Beneath the setting sun."

Cost may doom Costner's 'Waterworld' to heaven's gate

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. — The director of "Waterworld," the most expensive movie ever made, has quit in disgust with star Kevin Costner and Universal Pictures three months before the premiere.

Kevin Reynolds stopped working on the futuristic thriller last week when it became obvious his cut of the film didn't please Costner or the studio, sources said Tuesday.

Reynolds, a longtime Costner colleague, has a stellar falling out during the editing of 1991's "Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves." Reynolds also quit that film several weeks before its premiere. The two patched up their relationship and Costner produced Reynolds' "Rapa Nui" film last

year. Sources familiar with behind-the-scenes action at "Waterworld" said Reynolds wanted to test-screen his version of the movie, but Costner and Universal felt it wasn't good enough.

"The movie was plagued by expensive production delays in the waters off Hawaii, where the movie's set sank to the bottom of the ocean. Costs have mounted to \$175 million."

Costner, the Oscar-winning director of "Dances With Wolves," will play a prominent role in supervising completion of the film.

Neither Costner nor Reynolds would comment. Reynolds was said to be "listening to classical music and thinking about his home in Seattle," according to an associate.

Costner desperately needs another hit. His last three movies have not performed well at the box office. "A Perfect World," which also starred Clint Eastwood, brought in \$31.1 million domestically, while "Wyatt Earp," Costner's biggest stumble to date, grossed only \$25 million. "The War," in which Costner took second billing to Elijah Wood, took in only \$16.5 million.

It is no longer a joke when people quip that "Waterworld" could become Costner's Waterloo. Others have labeled it "Kevin's Gate," a reference to the 1980 Western's "Heaven's Gate," which seriously crippled the old Universal studio and is often cited as the biggest movie fiasco ever.

Reynolds was first reported Tuesday by "Daily Variety."

The trade newspaper quoted Sid Sheinberg, the president of Universal parent MCA Inc., as saying the resignation would not hurt the film.

MCA is in the midst of being acquired by Seagram Co., which is purchasing 80 percent of the entertainment giant from Japan's Matsushita Electric Industrial Co. for \$5.8 billion.

"Waterworld," which is due to reach theaters July 28, must generate an estimated \$400 million in worldwide revenues (including theaters, home video and TV) to break even. The megahit "Forrest Gump" and "The Lion King" made more than \$300 million in North American movie theaters last year. Domestic box office receipts can account for about a quarter of total revenue worldwide.

Born Bill Browder in Humboldt, Tenn., Sheppard chose his stage name during the '70s because he "liked the sound of it." Since then, he's been the good shepherd for a number of children's charities, funneling large sums of money into the various causes.

"I'm a child freak," said Sheppard in a Wednesday phone interview. "I love kids."

His most recent venture is an orphanage designed to house up to 100 children. He's building the orphanage in the Great Smoky Mountains, where he makes his home.

The road from there to here has earned Sheppard lots of Smoky Mountain money.

When he was 15, the young singer left home to try his musical wings in Memphis. He met up with Elvis Presley, who encouraged him to the extent of giving him his first tour bus.

"For a while, Sheppard worked as a record executive for RCA Victor. Eventually, he racked up his own hits like "Last Chancer's Waltz," "I Loved 'Em Every One" and "Finally." Today, he has 17 No. 1 singles to his credit.

Always the businessman, Sheppard opened a bed-and-breakfast lodge in the Great Smoky Mountains several years ago. He's since sold the 134-year-old house and built his own home in the Smokies. It's modern California style, with lots of glass, plants and light, airy room decor.

Today, Sheppard is in the water business. "It's one of our greatest natural re-

sources slowly coming to an end," he said.

His bottling plants, under the name Tennessee Mountain Pure, are in operation in 18 states. Proceeds go toward the construction of the orphanage.

Sheppard is also part owner of Guitars and Cadillacs, a Kansas City dance spot, with four franchises across the country.

He once had his own auto racing team, but that was when he was national spokesman for Folgers Coffee, the company that served as under-

writer for the racers.

"When Folgers got out of racing, I didn't feel like putting \$5 million a year into it," Sheppard said. "But I'm still an avid fan."

He likes cooking, too, as long as it's outdoors in a barbecue pit.

"I have a pit that has a steamer and a smoker," he said, "but my wife is really the cook."

Sheppard and his second wife have been married for 24 years. Sheppard's son, who's 25, is a rock 'n' roller trying to put together his first band.

"He's a turncoat," said Sheppard, with a laugh.

Coming soon: Sheppard will have a new album titled "Seven Year Itch." He said it's about what's happening today in country music, with a bit of scabbiety tossed in for good measure. The album contains r-makes, too, like one of Eric Clapton's "You Look Wonderful Tonight."

T.G. Sheppard will perform two shows a night Tuesday through May 14 at Cactus Petes Resort Casino in Jackpot. The 8 p.m. show is a dinner show, and the 11 p.m. show is a cocktail show. Dinner show prices start at \$19.95 on week-ends; \$14.95 on week-nights. There's a \$12.50 cover charge for the cocktail show on week-ends; \$10 on week-nights. Later this year, Sheppard plans to open his 1,500-seat T.G. Sheppard Theater in the Smokies in Pigeon Forge, Tenn., near Dollywood. He will perform there 200 days a year and do another 30 or 40 days in Nevada.

"He's 50 now, and he's happy. "My goals are not money or fame," he said. "Basically, I want inner peace and contentment and good health because, if you have those, you are the wealthiest person in the world."

Sheppard's inner peace comes from his spiritual side, he said. A Southern Baptist, he believes "there is a supreme being and life is on a pre-determined course."

He continued, "I come from a religious family, but I rebelled until I realized God really controls everything in our lives. Now I mention, in all of my concerts, that the number one priority in life is God."

Sproken like a true good shepherd.

TWIN FALLS — Twin Falls musician Travis Johnson is hoping Tuesday night will be his big break.

Johnson, 22 and a 1991 graduate of Twin Falls High School, moved to Nashville, Tenn., two years ago seeking country music fame and fortune. He met up with the members of the Steve Eaton Band, who happened to be from Pocatello, and cut an album to send to record companies. An executive from one of those companies, an independent label, is making the trip from Los Angeles to hear Johnson perform Tuesday night.

Even if this doesn't turn out to be "the moment," Johnson is prepared to keep on paying his dues. There is nothing else he wants to do but make music, he says.

He started singing when he was 4 and taught himself to play the guitar when he was 11. Instead of performing with school music groups, he played in bars at night. "Music was all I did in school," said Johnson, who recalled writing most of his songs at 2 a.m., after the bars closed. "I had no social life."

Johnson won a state prize in the nationally-sponsored Country Music Showdown in 1992. One of the participants in the competition, suggested he move to Nashville and try his tune-strumming wings.

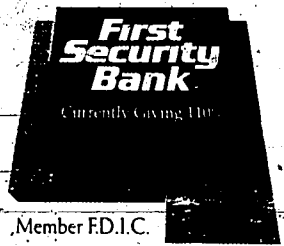
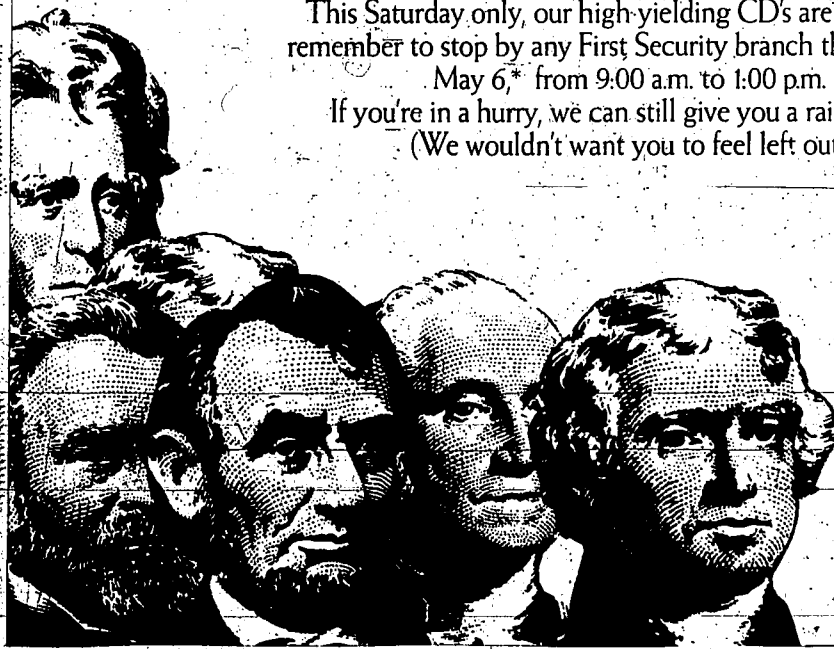

Jayhawks thrive in defying label definition

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Tired of spending your hard-earned bucks on a million different records to satisfy ALL your musical tastes?

Try the Jayhawks, whose combination of country, alternative pop and blues-rock evokes everyone from the Byrds to the Flying Burrito Brothers, and everyone in between.

"We see ourselves as a real music in value for the consumer," guitarist-songwriter Gary Louris says in jest, "because instead of having to buy like 10 records, you get all these different things."

He delights in being tough to pigeonhole.

"I like everything about not

being categorized, except for the fact that it makes it hard to sell records, just because of the way the music business works. You need references."

He mentioned a review in *People* magazine of the band's latest album, "Tomorrow the Green Grass," the follow-up to their American-Recordings debut, "Hollywood Town Hall."

"The only person who isn't going to like this record is the store clerk who has to figure out where to file it," Louris said, quoting the article. "It's intriguing to us... it's fun to throw curves and keep people guessing."

But if you're looking for a band who loudly proclaim messages in

their songs or who wear their collective hearts on their sleeves, the Jayhawks aren't it. Their songs are filled with a sense of disappointment of being let down; emotions rest beneath the surface and only seep out in bits and shards and well-chosen phrases.

The Minneapolis-born Louris attributes that to a certain Midwest reticence.

"It's not everybody's business to know exactly what went on in your life," he said. "They can take a certain experience and they can add the vibes of their life. That maybe is more meaningful."

Singer-songwriter Mark Olson calls the band's approach to lyrics a "passive" way of writing.

"It just seems to come natural," he said. "When we work on songs together, we kind of hone them and let them interpret themselves... rather than trying to manipulate it so it is what it is. It's more like letting it happen."

"It's a modern way of writing lyrics — we're not very retro."

Louris and Olson sheepishly admitted that many of their most punchy lyrics were conceived under the gun — in the studio. They both laughed when most of the lines brought up fit that category.

"So what's that tell them about their songwriting modus operandi?" "Maybe we should do that more," Olson said. "Maybe we should be more off-the-cuff."

CHICAGO - Michael Jordan shook off a poor shooting performance to score seven of Chicago's final nine points Thursday night as the Bulls survived a third-quarter collapse and advanced to the second round of the playoffs with an 89-83 victory over the Charlotte Hornets.

Jordan scored 24 points on 8-of-21 shooting but made two free throws with 1:07 to play for the Bulls, who won the series 2-1.

Scottie Pippen also had 24 points and Toni Kukoc added 21 to Chicago, which awaits the winner of the Orlando-Boston series. Orlando leads 2-1 with Game 4 Friday at Boston Garden.

Alonzo Mourning had 20 points and 13 rebounds for the Hornets, who had several chances to force a decisive fifth game in Charlotte but couldn't connect down the stretch.

Since falling to Detroit in the 1990 Eastern Conference semifinals, the Bulls have won 13 consecutive playoff series with Jordan in the lineup - including the 1991, 1992 and 1993 NBA Finals. Jordan retired after the '93 title but returned for this season's final 17 regular-season games.

Larry Johnson missed a 17-footer with about 8 seconds left, but Charlotte grabbed the rebound and called time out.

Johnson's 20-footer was short of the basket, and Hersey Hawkins grabbed the ball, but his reverse layup fell short. Dell Curry put in the rebound, but time already had expired.

When the final horn sounded, Johnson lay face down on the United Center court. He slowly got up and walked to the locker room, shoving a television cameraman out of his way en route.

The Bulls led 54-44 at half-time, but Charlotte scored the first 12 points of the second half and remained close to the rest of the way.

Chicago was 4-for-18 in the third period and was outscored 24-11. It was the lowest scoring playoff quarter ever for the

Bulls, who went into the final period trailing 68-65. Hawkins, who had two points in the first half for the Hornets, had nine in the third.

Neither team scored a basket in the fourth period until Bill Wennington's dunk 4½ minutes in pulled Chicago to 70-68.

Charlotte maintained a slim lead until Jordan, who had missed six of seven second-half shots, scored on a drive, was fouled by Mourning and made the free throw for a 79-78 Bulls edge. Jordan also hit a 20-footer down the stretch.

Hawkins made two free throws with 1:54 left for an 84-83 Hornets lead.

U.S. women prepare to defend World Cup title

DAVIDSON, N.C. - The days of total anonymity are slowly disappearing for the women of American soccer. There are now network television commercials and major show endorsements. There are T-shirts and posters and videos.

When the players tried to get to the locker room following a 6-0 exhibition rout of Finland here Sunday, they were ambushed by dozens of autograph-seeking teen-age fans.

Fans who want to be like Mia, Michelle and Mary.

This is what is happening to the world's best national women's soccer team. This is what is happening to U.S. soccer's greatest success story.

The American women will try to add another happy chapter next month at the Women's World Cup in Sweden. They are the defending champions, having won the inaugural tournament in China in 1991, and they are favored to win it again.

"This is really different than '91 because we were rookies at that World Cup," said Michelle Akers, 29, a 5-foot-10 striker who has averaged nearly a goal a game in her 10-year U.S. career.

"Now we're a little more in the spotlight and people know who we are. The rest of the world is gunning for us, and I really like it that way. It's going to be a real challenge, a real test, on how tough we're mentally and how much we're willing to give up in order to win. I really like these kinds of tests."

Soccer, for the most part, belongs to the men of the world. To Brazil and England and Germany and Italy. The U.S. men's team is slowly gaining ground - an upset over Colombia in the World Cup's first round, a respectable 1-0 elimination by Brazil in the second round, a handful of promising young players recruited to play

overseas professionally.

But in the women's game, the United States is the world leader.

"It all started about 10 years ago when soccer's world governing body, Federation Internationale de Football Association, decided to give the women's game a push forward and make it competitive internationally." FIFA said. "Here's the women's game, you're all at the same starting point, let's see who can get to the finish line first." U.S. Coach Tony DiCiccio said. "And the Americans did. That was great, but one finish line was not enough. We want to do it again."

Cinderella Celtics prepare to face Magic — again

BOSTON (AP) — Surprised that the Boston Celtics are still around after three games of their first-round playoff series against Orlando? So are they.

"We knew that we were underdogs and the odds were stacked against us," Celtics coach Chris Ford said. "After the first game, everybody gamesteamed, that's the players probably had some doubts. But they've played hard and they've played well. I think they believe now."

That was the first question I asked them after the game (Wednesday) night: "Do you believe you can win?"

"They all said, 'Yes.'"

The Celtics stumbled into the final playoff berth in the Eastern Conference with a 35-47 record — the only playoff team with a losing record. In the opener of the five-game series, the top-seeded Magic handed them the worst loss in the franchise's 49-year history, 124-77.

But before anyone could say

"three and out," the Celtics won Game 2, 99-92 at Orlando. And in Game 3 on Wednesday night, Boston led 77-74 with 1:10 left before Nick Anderson sank a 3-pointer to tie it.

Orlando went on to win 82-77. "It's strange to hear a No. 8 seed say No. 1 seed stole the game from them, but that's what happened," Celtics guard Doc Brown said. "They (the Magic) were happy to get out of the building with a win."

"After the first game, everybody said, 'It's going to be a short series.' I don't think anybody expected this."

Magic coach Brian Hill was not of the doubters.

"They didn't have to prove anything to me," he said, recalling top-seeded Seattle's first-round loss to Denver last year in the Western Conference playoffs.

"We've always had respect for them," former Celtic Brian Shaw said. "We didn't expect to win the game by 47 points the first night."

When something like that happens you naturally let up. We did, and they made us pay for it."

The Celtics have more in mind than just showing they belong. "We're not ready to go home yet," forward Dominique Wilkins said. "We've proven it. We've already proved it. We proved it (Wednesday) night. Now we couldn't come away with one."

Wilkins and many of the other Celtics talked about Wednesday night's loss as the one that got away.

After Orlando tied it at 28-28, forward Hardaway blocked Wilkins in the lane and Shaquille O'Neal got the go-ahead basket of a followup dunk with 28 seconds left.

But Boston still had its chances. Brown missed a 3-point attempt to tie it in the final seconds, and when the rebound found its way back to him, he missed again.

"We did a lot of good things, and we did some things that cost us the game," center Eric Montross said. "We've learned some things that

we're going to apply towards (Friday) night."

Unless they win two straight against Orlando, Friday night's game will be the last for the Celtics play in Boston Garden, which will close this fall to make way for the FleetCenter new dome.

And the fans who bussed the team during its lackluster season, have grown tired as they counted down the 6-year-old building's final days.

"Of all the games I've played," said Wilkins, a 13-year veteran, "I've never seen a crowd that responded like they did last night. I've seen some good crowds, but never a crowd that went nuts like that."

Former coach Red Auerbach, now the team's president, said he resisted the temptation to get misty-eyed thinking about the final Celtics game in the Garden.

"At the last regular-season game, you had a tribute and that's over with," he said. "Right now there's a game. And it's an important game."

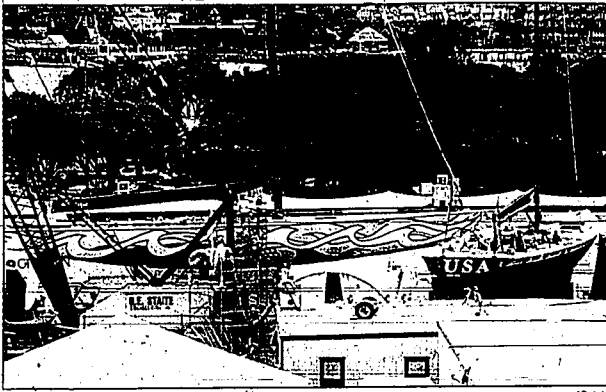

Conner returns to Cup finals

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Like it or not, Big Bad Dennis Conner is back in the America's Cup finals. The skipper who once angered an entire nation, and who's simultaneously praised and panned even in his hometown, has pulled off another miracle comeback and will try to win the America's Cup for the fifth time in 21 years. Conner will defend the trophy for the second time in his home waters beginning Saturday against Team New Zealand. It's his unprecedented seventh America's Cup campaign, and his sixth appearance in the finals. "One of the few things about being 'old' is you know things," the 52-year-old Conner said on Thursday. "My job here is not what you do for me yesterday, Dennis, it's what can you do for me starting at 11:30 on Saturday afternoon? Because that's what's at stake to really matter, and that's what I'm focused on." "Having won this thing four times and lost it once, I can tell you it's a lot better to win than lose."

Conner is the only man to lose the Cup and then win it back. Along the way, he's never been far from controversy. Conner's two previous encounters with the Kiwis helped define that image. In 1987, he beat Kiwi Magic en route to winning back the Cup he lost to Australia II in 1983. He also infuriated New Zealanders by implying that the Kiwis sailors might be cheating because they had built a 1.2-meter sailboat out of fiberglass. Thus his nickname, Big Bad Dennis. A year later, he and the San Diego Yacht Club were embroiled in one of the most bizarre episodes in America's Cup history. New Zealand's Michael Fay issued a surprise challenge, which Conner turned back by sailing his catamaran to two easy victories over Fay's 132-foot boat. At the press conference after the second race, Conner called New Zealand boat designer Bruce Farr a "loser."

"Conner's an interesting character," said Gary Jobson, a former America's Cup sailor who's now an ESPN analyst. "People either love him or they hate him, and there's no middle ground. People certainly respect his sailing ability and those close to him are loyal." "He's a very difficult man to get to know," Jobson added. "He's guarded and stays inward with his little circle." The love-hate relationship was on display Monday, Outside City Hall, when Conner was honored at a rally attended by Mayor Susan Golding. On the airwaves, radio talk show host Stacy Taylor polled listeners on who was a bigger Cup villain, Conner or Bill Koch, who stirred his own controversy by adding a man to his previously all-women's team. "They think he's the Ty Cobb of yacht racing, because he appears to be totally lacking in social skills or social grace," Taylor said in an interview.

Picking the perfect goalie

Rangers wonder which good goalie will start playoffs

Two good goalkeepers are usually better than one — except when it comes to the Stanley Cup playoffs. Then, it's preferable to follow one hot goaltender, as most teams have discovered. Unfortunately, the New York Rangers here, in problem in this regard as they begin defense of their Stanley Cup championship Saturday. They will rely on Mike Richter or Glenn Healy against the Quebec Nordiques in Game 1? "It would be the perfect world if we had a goalie playing in the last eight games and winning seven of the eight," Rangers coach Colin Campbell said. "We just hope we pick the right guy." Richter, who led the Rangers to the 1994 championship last year, was regarded as the No. 1 goalie at the start of this season. He looked the part at the outset, when he was playing well even though the rest of the team wasn't. The second half wasn't as good for Richter, who has been supplanted in recent key starts by Healy, a perennial backup. "He was Healy who made it in the Rangers' playoff-clinching 2-0

victory at Philadelphia Sunday. And it was Healy who started the Rangers' final game of the season, a 4-3 loss to Florida Wednesday night. "Should anything be read into that? "It was not a big deal," Healy said of starting the final two games. "The only one who is a better goalie is the situation out of proportion is the press." "The only controversy is what is created by (reporters), not the team. Our job is to win and to bring another Stanley Cup here, in whatever way that may be." "In other-playoff matchups this weekend" in the Eastern Conference, it will be Washington at Pittsburgh, Buffalo at Philadelphia and New Jersey at Boston. In the Western Conference, it will be Dallas at Detroit, San Jose at Calgary, Vancouver at St. Louis and Toronto at Chicago. The Washington-Pittsburgh series begins Saturday, the others Sunday. Goalkeeping dilemmas are nothing new to the Rangers. Before the Richter-Healy situation, it was Richter and John Vanbiesbrouck, now a member of the Florida Panthers. In the 1991-92 season, Richter and Vanbiesbrouck were used in a unique rotating goaltender system where one started every other game. It helped the Rangers forge the NHL's best record during the

regular season. But it didn't help in the playoffs, when the Rangers lost in the early rounds to Pittsburgh, the eventual Stanley Cup champion. "The past is the past," Healy said. "There is different personnel here, different people that were involved in the decision-making and different scenarios." "Mike is a much different goalie than he was four years ago. I'm a much different goalie and our relationship is extremely good. The bottom line for our club is winning. Egos and personal agendas have to be put aside at this point." "Still, that hasn't made it any easier on Campbell in making his selection for a starting goaltender in the playoffs. Richter was 14-17-2 during the regular season and Healy was 8-6-1. Healy's record was even better in games started following losses by Richter: 7-3-1. "Both goalkeepers are very stable," said Campbell, whose team was 9-13 this season in one-goal games. "The situation (with the goalkeepers) was not created on purpose — we wanted to win." "We tried hard to go with the guy that won the Stanley Cup last year and we did that, and he played well in the first half of the season. We lost some games and we had to do some (different) things. Both are hard-working and they'll accept what's going to happen in the final game."

Schaller will meet Corretja in the quarterfinals. Quarterfinal play on Friday also matches third-seeded Michael Stich of Germany against Sweden's Stefan Poberg.

Michigan grid coach resigns after arrest
ANN ARBOR, Mich. — Gary Moeller resigned as Michigan football coach Thursday following a drunk-and-drive incident at a suburban Detroit restaurant last week. Defensive coordinator Lloyd Carr was appointed interim coach while the search for a successor begins for one of the country's top football programs. Moeller's resignation, announced at a news conference by Michigan athletic director Joe Roberson, stunned players and staff. "This is one of the saddest days of my life," said Carr, his voice choking. "A man I respect, have the utmost admiration for, is no longer here. I would not be honest if I say we are not wounded or feel great pain." Carr said Moeller, 54, met with the assistants earlier in the day to tell them of his decision. Moeller was arrested on misdemeanor charges of disorderly conduct and assault and battery after his outburst at a restaurant Friday. According to Southfield police, Moeller was intoxicated and punched a police officer in the chest. He had not commented since the arrest and he faces a court appearance May 12.

Heat head coach Gentry loses job
MIAMI — A late-season slump that cost the Miami Heat a berth in the NBA playoffs cost Alvin Gentry his coaching job Thursday. Gentry, 40, compiled a 78-21 record after replacing Kevin Loughery during a shakeup 10 weeks ago. Overall, the Heat finished 32-50, three games out of the last playoff spot in the Eastern Conference. The team lost six of its final eight games. Gentry, the Heat's third head coach in eight years, was unavailable for comment. Wohl said he has compiled a list of four or five candidates from the college and pro coaching ranks and hopes to have a replacement by June 1. He would not confirm any names.

Colorado cyclist wins Tour DuPont stage
ASHEVILLE, N.C. — Clark Sheehan rode away from a crowded springer Dianpidin Adjuaparov to capture the eighth stage of the Tour DuPont on Thursday. Lance Armstrong kept his leader's position for the fifth day. On a rainy and treacherous day for cycling, Sheehan covered the 127-mile run from Greenville, S.C., to Asheville in 5 hours, 33 minutes and 56 seconds. Sheehan, a sixth-year pro from Boulder, Colo., severely injured his back two years ago when he was pinned between two race vehicles during the Tour of Mexico. Andrei Teterikov of Kazakhstan was second-in 5:34:03, with Laurent Madouas of France third in 5:34:06. The stage was held under overcast skies and in a steady, intermittent rain that resulted in slick conditions. Armstrong of Austin, Texas, who took the race lead last Sunday, finished sixth and remains 2:43 ahead of Motorola teammate Andrea Peron of Italy. Peron, the winner of the stage last year, finished fourth. Viatcheslav Ekimov (Novelli) of Russia, who placed fifth, remains third, 2:53 behind. Three stages of the 12-day event remain.

Fiel takes shape for Kentucky Derby

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Although the speedy filly Serena's Song and her champion stablemate Timber Country drew outside posts for the Kentucky Derby, trainer D. Wayne Lukas was more concerned about where they finish than where they start. "You never know if you drew a good post position until the race is over," Lukas said Thursday, after Serena's Song drew the No. 13 post and Timber Country drew No. 15 in the field of 19 3-year-olds for the 1 1/4-mile Derby Saturday at Churchill Downs. "I thought I had a great post position with Tabasco at, but he got hurt at the start," Lukas said. Tabasco Cat was forced into another horse after breaking from the No. 9 post in the 1994 Derby. He lost all chance of winning and finished sixth before going on to win the Preakness and Belmont Stakes. While Lukas put the best face possible on the post positions for Serena's Song and Timber Country, and that of his other starter, Thunder Gulch (No. 16), rival trainers would barely suppress a smile. "I didn't hurt my feelings," Gary Lewis, trainer of runner-up Tejuano Four at 10-1, said of Lukas' draw. "I wouldn't want to be Wayne," said trainer Tony Reaminder, whose Knockdown will start from the No. 2 hole and race as part of the six-horse mutual field. The entry of Serena's Song and Timber Country was made the 5-2 early choice. They will be coupled in the betting because Robert and Beverly Lewis own Serena's Song and co-own Timber Country. "I think the odds on Serena's Song would be farther inside," Lukas said. "But more importantly, there's a six-foot gap between the main gate and the auxiliary." Because of that gap, he thought they should get away from the gate clean. "Being in the No. 15 post means Timber Country, the champion 2-year-old of 1994, will be the first horse to open his gate. No. 14 Tejuano Run is the outside horse in the main gate. "Serena's Song is least likely to get hurt by the post position because she has such a good turn of foot," said Lukas, whose only victory in 14 Derbys was with the filly Winning Colors in 1988. Winning Colors broke from the No. 11 post and led all the way. Serena's Song has led all the way in four of her eight career starts, including her victory over seven colts in the 1 1/4-mile San Juan Beap April 1 at Turfway Park. In one of her two second-year starts, she stumped in a big effort, only to be beaten by a head by her stablemate Flanders in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 5 at Churchill Downs. Timber Country's last victory, at Churchill Downs in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, clinched the 2-year-old championship in the colts' race. He likes to race from off the pace, but not far off, is winless in three starts

his year. But he has been beaten by only a total of 46 lengths. Two other leading contenders are Canadian-bred Talkin Man at 7-2 and Afternoon Delites at 9-2, both of whom like to race on or near the lead. Talkin Man, who drew the No. 11 post, won the Gotham and Wood Memorial at Aqueduct in his only two starts this year. Afternoon Delites, who will start from the No. 12 post, won the first five starts of his career before being caught at the wire by Larry the Legend and losing the Santa Anita Derby by a head. Afternoon Delites is owned by composer-singer Burt Bacharach. In at 12-1 is Suave Prospect, who could make Julie Krone the first woman to ride a Derby winner and give trainer Nick Zito his third Derby victory in five years. Suave Prospect, second in each of his last three races, drew the No. 6 post. Strike the Gold, Zito's 1991 Derby winner, started from the No. 5 post. Go for Gin won from the No. 8 post for Zito last year. Also at 12-1 is Elitish, making him the most highly regarded of the three Group-based Derby starters. "All of Elitish's seven career starts have been in England — except one — and that was an impressive second-place finish to Timber Country in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "This race should suit him," trainer Henry Cecil said. "After he ran in the Breeders' Cup, the price said, 'He'd be a Kentucky Derby horse.' I thought the same thing."

Top-seed Pierce retreats from match
HAMBURG, Germany — Illness forced top-seeded Mary Pierce to retire from her match at the Citizen Cup tournament Thursday. Pierce, the Australian Open champion, easily beat Germany's Petra Bergerov 6-3 in the first set, and Bergerov won the second 7-5. Bergerov was ahead 3-0 in the third set when Pierce retired. "I felt tired. I was dizzy and feeling bad," Pierce said. Pierce, 20, is battling the effects of a kidney infection, tournament officials said. Bergerov will now play fellow German and fifth-seed Anke Huber in the quarterfinals. Huber, 20, breezed past American Ann Grossman 6-3, 6-1. Little-known Jana Kandarr of Germany defeated second-seeded Brenda Schultz of the Netherlands, 7-6 (7-3). Kandarr's next match is with second-seed and Wimbledon champion Conchita Martinez of Spain. Judith Wiesner of Austria beat Germany's Wiltrud Probst 6-1, 6-4. She faces 14-year-old Martina Hingis of Switzerland in the quarterfinals. Hingis pulled off an upset Wednesday, beating third-seeded Jana Novotna of the Czech Republic 6-1, 2-6, 6-2.

THE ACES ON BRIDGE

"If you want work well done, select a busy man. The other kind has no time."
—Elbert Hubbard

It takes a busy declarer with a clear plan to score the game. However, if he gets busy in the wrong direction, he loses his chance for 10 winners. As usual, one should consider the bidding before committing.

A player who draws trumps while he develops his plan wins the trump lead in hand and leads a second trump to dummy. He continues by leading a diamond to West's king. West forces South to ruff. West exits in clubs, dummy's ace wins and South tries diamonds again. Dummy's eight going to West's nine. West forces South to ruff a club and South ruffs a low diamond in dummy, hoping to drop the ace. When this fails, he loses two spades and two diamonds, down on a hand he should have made.

To succeed, South must force the defenders to help. West's takeout double should warn him that leading toward his hand won't work, so he must find a better plan.

After winning the first trump in dummy, South should cash the 10 to the ace and ruff a club. He leads a second trump to dummy to ruff dummy's last club, leaving only one trump in his own hand. He then exits with a low diamond toward dummy and the defense is finished. If West wins, he has no safe lead. If East wins the 10, it leads to the same result. South covers East's exit (spades or diamonds) and West leads his own suit to suffer the same ending. Whatever he leads concedes a 10th winner for South.







Ski accident can't keep Danza down

Even a skiing accident can't keep Tony Danza down for very long.

Just a little more than a year after his terrible ordeal, Danza returns with a vengeance literally - in CBS' "Deadly Whispers," debuting Wednesday, May 10.

He stars in the dramatic film as Tom Accon, a seemingly devoted husband and father. He and his wife, Carol (Pamela Reed), who were both born poor, have worked hard to make for a comfortable home for their three children.

Their quiet life is shaken when their oldest child, Kathy (Heather Tom, "The Young and the Restless"), the apple of her father's eye, decides to move out on her own and date a married man. Tom is entirely opposed.

Soon thereafter, Kathy is found murdered.

After fruitfully searching for the supposed killer, Tom becomes the prime suspect. Carol refuses to believe he could commit such a crime, until a dark side of her husband emerges.

For Danza, the role of Tom was a big stretch from his work on the sitcom "Who's the Boss?" In spite of that, his work in "Whispers" is exceptional. Danza carries the intense role with such ease that the make-up complex character seem very realistic.

"You've got to be able to try to do other things," he says. "This (film) offered me a chance to do other things."

As Tom, Danza has to switch from a loving father to a cold-blooded psychopath. He says he found the well-written script helped him achieve this switch effectively.

"The script is very, very detailed and tangible," he comments.

"But there was some preparation involved."

The actor says he wants to expand his horizons and try new roles. Still, Danza did not take the character solely because it was darker and different than previous roles.

"If you list the titles (of TV movies), they tend to run toward the darker side," he points out. "(Co-executive producer) Leonard Hill (sent the script) to me, probably not thinking I would take it. And I thought, 'Gee, this is interesting.' I didn't say, 'Wow, this is on the dark side, so I'll take it.' I said, 'Gee, a pretty good story.' It was a page-turner."

Danza succeeds brilliantly in making Tom's suffering credible. Nevertheless, he was not Hill's original choice.

"There's an interesting confession-I make when I do comments."

"When we sent the script to Tony, actually, we did it under duress. CBS picked up the script and said, 'Terrific

Dennis Turner script. Now we want you to send it to Tony Danza.'"

"And I said, 'No, no wait. We've written this as a character who has no New York in him.' (They) said, 'Send it to Tony Danza. He'll figure out whether he's right for it.'"

Hill says he thinks television movies are a challenge to any actor, because the roles carry high demands.

"(TV films) allow and force actors to take on very challenging parts in extraordinarily limited periods of time," he says. "To work at that pace, to do the kind of work ... where you don't have a chance to go back and do reshoots two months after the film wraps ... is, I think, a real test."

Danza's portrayal of Tom shows he used good judgment in taking the part. But, Hill says he thinks there is more to good actors

than just the material they choose.

"The sign of good actors is not just their willingness to undertake difficult and challenging material, which Tony certainly showed in selecting this, but the other actors who choose to work with him," Hill says. "The ensemble works brilliantly together. I think that's what makes this movie rise above a genre that may be already fairly common on television."

Although his unfortunate accident was a setback, Danza says he has gained a new perspective from that experience.

"It's funny, you know, when you get hurt like that, it doesn't just impact you," he says. "It impacts your kids, every body."

"There used to be a time when, I think ... if I had done this part, I would have been joking around and then ... done the part," he says. "I can't do that so much anymore."

A: Esquivel has slapped her former husband with a multimillion dollar suit, claiming that her ex, Alfonso Arau, tricked her into signing a document that gave him all rights to her work. Since the agreement was written in English, a language Arau knew she isn't fluent in, she didn't realize what she was signing away. We're talking a lot of money here, as the two-year-old movie has grossed more than any other Spanish-language film.

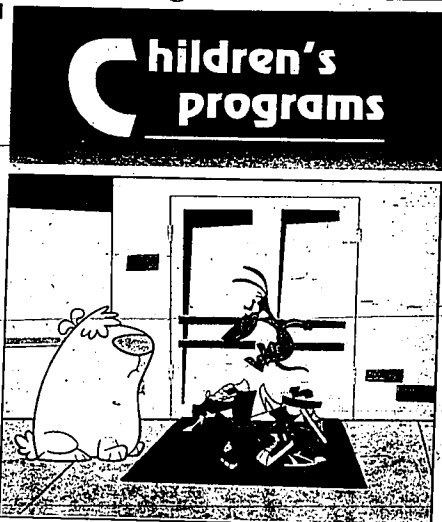

Seated next to Executive Producer Laurence Cuso, Ms. Wagner regaled the room with memories of the soap through the years. "Don was one of the nicest people I've ever worked with," the actress said. "The last time he came back on the show was for Chris and Nancy's 50th wedding anniversary story. Cuso said there will be some well-chosen flashbacks in the 10,000th episode, but he stressed the show will continue with the current storylines and not be a clip show. As for the future of the show, he added, "There is no end in sight."

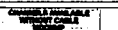
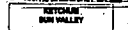

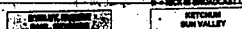
