Parade changes irk downtowners

TWIN FALLS — An unexpected change in the route for this year's Western Days Parade has angered downtown business leaders.

Lauri Woolworth, chairwoman of the Business Improvement District and a vice president at Obenchain Insurance, said Thursday she's "not happy at all" that parade organizers have decided to bypass Main Avenue.

The Western Days Parade "is celebrating our historical roots," roots that necessarily should include Main Avenue, Woolworth said.

"It's not Blue Lakes Boulevard, and it's not CSI — the center of our town is the downtown," she said.

Organizers of the June 3 parade decided Wednesday to bypass Main Avenue. Instead, floats will continue down Shoshone Street to a new finish line near the railroad tracks. Floats originally were supposed to make a right turn from Shoshone onto Main and head north to the IGA grocery store.

Sharon Bryan, city clerk and Western Days chairwoman, said Thursday the route needed to be changed to accommodate the semi trailers that carry the parade floats.

"Those 60-foot trailers can't make that

turn," Bryan said. "It's too narrow."

Bryan said the new route is shorter, has fewer turns and still marches through downtown.

It's the second time in the past month

that the route has been detoured from its original path.

Woolworth said downtown merchants and the public should have received earlier notice that the route would be changing.

New parade route

The 13th annual Western Days Parade will start at noon Saturday, June 3, from the main entrance at the College of Southern Idaho. Floats will roll east on Falls Avenue, then south down Blue Lakes Boulevard and southwest on Shoshone Street to its completion near the railroad tracks.

This year's parade theme is, "Memories of Yesterday, Visions of Tomorrow." For more information, contact Sharon Bryan, city clerk and Western Days chairwoman, at 736-2245.

She wants this year's parade to turn from Shoshone Street onto Second Avenue East and then cross over to Main Avenue, as it has in recent years.

Jeanne Wilson, the BID's executive director, said the district had planned to have a master of ceremonies as well as speakers at counts at Main Avenue stores and restaurants in conjunction with the parade.

Midnight gunman hits home

BURCEY — Shortly after midnight Thursday, Shirley Halford and her husband, Andy Hubbard, were lying in bed watching television when they heard three quick bangs.

"We both looked at each other and said, 'Was that gunshots?'" she said, just before they ran through the house looking for their children.

Halford's home at 460 South, 250 East was hit once by a bullet in an apparent drive-by shooting Thursday morning. The lone slug that struck the trailer home, thought to be a .22-caliber, is still lodged in her daughter's bedroom wall.

The bullet penetrated the trailer house at an upward angle, entering through the outer wall to Halford's daughter's room, through an open closet door before glancing off the ceiling and imbedding itself in another wall, according to a police report.

The bedroom was occupied by three teen-agers when the bullet came flying in, Halford said. It entered the room six to seven feet high on the wall, she said, low enough to endanger the teens.

A friend of Halford's daughter, Jeremy Carlson, was on the back porch of the trailer when he heard the shots. He told police he saw a white car, possibly a Pontiac

Bad memories afloat as Missouri rivers rise

HARTSBURG, Mo. — Anxieties rose Thursday along with the Missouri River, as hundreds of people who suffered during the Flood of '93 packed up and moved out. "You get out and let the river do what it has to do," said Dennis Groves, a 38-year Hartsburg resident who had 5 feet of water in his white frame house two summers ago. A dozen friends helped load his belongings onto pickup trucks.

Missouri has gotten 5 to 10 inches of rain since Sunday, and more is forecast through the weekend. The rain follows a couple of weeks of wet weather upstream in South Dakota and Nebraska that had already swollen the river.

Two deaths were blamed on flooding in Missouri: One man drowned when he tried to drive through a flooded creek, and one traffic death was blamed on standing water. Hundreds of people were also evacuated in Illinois.

Spring flooding along the Missouri River's lower reaches is unusual; residents expect a flood about every five to 10 years. And this week's high water is a far cry from the 1993 flood, which was caused by a month and a half of rain measured in feet. That disaster was blamed for 48

deaths and up to \$16 billion in damage in nine Midwest states.

But with memories of 1993 still fresh, and broken levees not all replaced along the river, flood survivors are taking no

'Jurassic Park' bacteria awakened after long snooze

WASHINGTON — When an ancient stingless bee died after becoming trapped in tree sap, bacteria in its gut turned into a spore.

Now, in an experiment reminiscent of "Jurassic Park," scientists have awakened the bacteria from a 25-million-year sleep.

Not only is the prehistoric microbe alive and well, it is producing a natural antibiotic that is being studied to determine if it has any medical value, Raul J. Cano of California Polytechnic University said Thursday.

Cano said the bacterium spore was found in the remains of a bee that had been entombed in amber, a hardened resin from ancient pine trees. When the bee died, he said, the bacteria apparently turned into a spore and remained trapped until it was uncovered in the laboratory.

"Some bacteria make spores as a means of survival," Cano said. "These spores are resistant to chemicals, heat and to pressure. They enable a bacteria to withstand long periods of dormancy."

The researcher said the spores were not a form of reproduction for the bacteria, but a type of hibernation.

"They were in a deep slumber and we reawakened them," said Cano.

The amber that contained the bee was

aged at 25 million to 40 million years. Bacteria also have been found in amber that is at least 135 million years old, but Cano said this specimen has not been studied closely and its uniqueness has not been confirmed.

A report on the research, by Cano and Monica K. Borczyk, also of Cal Poly, is to be published Friday in Science, the journal of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

The study resembles work described

in the novel and movie "Jurassic Park." In that fictional plot, scientists re-created dinosaur DNA from mosquitoes that had been preserved in amber. The bee in the Cal Poly amber lived millions of years after dinosaurs died out.

Other researchers applauded Cano's work, but questioned whether the bacteria are, in fact, a modern contaminant and not from spores stored in the amber.

Camera in cell upsets bombing suspect

EL RENO, Okla. (AP) — Bombing suspect Timothy McVeigh is being subjected to a "kind of psychological warfare" with 24-hour camera surveillance in his prison isolation cell, his lawyer said Thursday.

Calling the treatment unnecessary and potentially harmful, lawyer Stephen Jones said he'll ask Attorney General Janet Reno to remove the cameras.

Jones spoke after a preliminary hearing at which a federal magistrate ordered that a second suspect, Terry Nichols, also remain jailed at the El Reno Federal Correctional Institution.

Jones said he will have McVeigh's mental and physical health examined to ensure he is competent to stand trial, although he said he had no reason to doubt McVeigh's mental health. McVeigh hasn't attempted or threatened suicide or even been injured, Jones said.

"I see the camera as simply an attempt to engage in a kind of psychological warfare and I think ultimately, perhaps, would have an effect on his mental stability — which might in turn affect the trial, at least the date of the trial, or whether one is ever held," Jones said.

Justice Department spokesman Carl Stern would not comment on Jones' statement.

McVeigh, 27, has been in federal custody since two days after the April 19 bombing, which killed 167 people when it shattered a federal office building in Oklahoma City.

U.S. Magistrate Ronald Howland ruled after Thursday's hearing that there was probable cause to keep Nichols, 41 — a buddy of McVeigh — in custody on bombing charges.

Nichols' lawyer, Michael Tigar, argued that his client is a victim of guilt by association and questionable circumstantial evidence.

"There are people out there who hold anti-government views," Tigar said. "Making inferences from associations is always dangerous."

Nichols has been in custody since he surrendered to police near his home in Herington, Kan., after hearing of McVeigh's arrest, Tigar suggested that his voluntary surrender showed Nichols is innocent.

"The guilty flee where no man pursueth, but the righteous are as bold as a lion," Tigar said, quoting from the Bible's Book of Proverbs.

That drew a reply from Merrick Garland, of Reno's office, that Nichols "came in voluntarily because he knew he was being looked for. That does not suggest innocence."

Howland gave Tigar seven days to file a motion in support of bail for Nichols. After that, prosecutors will have seven days to respond before a judge schedules a hearing.

The lone witness at Thursday's hearing, FBI Agent Erol Myers, testified mainly about what authorities have said was bomb-making material found in Nichols' home.

The material had already been cited in an affidavit that supported charging Nichols.

Nichols, not shackled or handcuffed, sat calmly and sometimes took notes.

Questioned by Tigar on a point that could suggest Nichols was not in Nichols' home the day of the bombing, Myers acknowledged there was evidence that someone with a male voice made telephone calls from Nichols' house that day.

Tigar asked about a fuel meter that agents said might have been used to measure fuel oil for the fertilizer-and-fuel-oil bomb that blew up the federal building. Myers admitted that the meter was not working when agents found it in Nichols' home days after the bombing.

Tigar also attacked FBI statements about detonator cord found at Nichols' home, and Myers admitted that federal bomb experts have not positively determined that detonator cord was used to set off the Oklahoma City bomb.

"I kind of believe what Sherlock

Holmes said to Watson: It's like a stick on the ground. It does point in one direction until you turn around and look at it from the other side, and then it points in the other direction."

Tigar told reporters outside the prison that Jones refused to comment directly on his conversations with McVeigh.

"He was cooperative and is working with us on the case," Jones said. "Like any other person in jail, he seems anxious."

He said McVeigh has been getting mail from friends and the general public, and has subscribed to The Daily Oklahoman newspaper and Newsweek.

Defense experts will begin inspecting the remains of the federal building Saturday morning, Jones said. A

bomb-weapons specialist and a consulting architect will make what Jones expects to be a quick inspection of the ruins.

The remaining part of the building is due for demolition Tuesday morning.

The Justice Department said Reno will visit Oklahoma City on Friday morning to offer sympathy to families of bombing victims, and thank investigators and prosecutors working on the case.

Controversial letter brings in NRA big bucks

WASHINGTON (AP) — Critics and apologists aside, the National Rifle Association says the fund-raising letter that prompted former President Bush to resign his membership is bringing in a huge amount of money.

Though declining to release specific dollar figures, NRA officials contend the letter has already drawn more than 900,000 responses — most of them positive — making it one of the group's most successful ever.

"This is going to do very, very well, and will raise well over a million dollars," said Wayne LaPierre, executive vice president of the NRA. "There is a very real concern out there about the issues we raised in that letter."

Those concerns — primarily over threats the group contends citizens face from government agents — have been overshadowed by the letter's graphic language, which included references to law enforcement officials as "jack-booted thugs."

Wednesday, after a week of growing criticism that began when Bush announced he had resigned in protest over the letter's tone, the NRA apologized for any offense, particularly to law enforcement officials. "I really feel bad about the fact that the words in that letter have been interpreted to apply to all federal law enforcement officers," NRA Executive Vice President Wayne LaPierre said. "If anyone thought the intention was to paint all federal law enforcement officers with the same broad brush, I'm sorry, and I apologize."

Police kill man who stole tank

SAN DIEGO (AP) — A man commandeered a 63-ton Army tank and rammed through neighborhoods, flattening utility poles, five hydrants and row upon row of cars before getting stuck on a concrete freeway divider.

Police fatally shot him as he tried to dislodge the tank. No bystanders were injured Wednesday evening after the theft from a National Guard armory. The tank's weapons — a 105 mm cannon, 12.7 mm anti-aircraft gun and 7.62 mm machine gun — were not loaded, said National Guard Maj. Ed Gale.

Police helplessly chased the tank until it crunched the 3-foot-tall highway divider and got stuck. "The guy was just going crazy," said Kelly Bird, who said he saw at least 25 cars flattened. "He was making cars over."

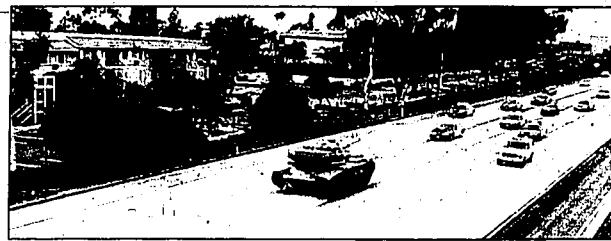
Tread marks led up to one 1983 Cadillac, which was smashed down

to a height of 12 feet.

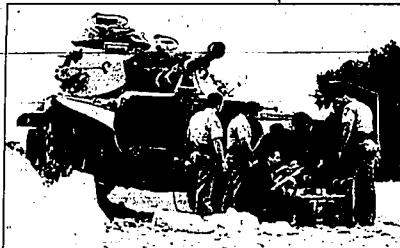
The driver was identified as Shawn Nelson. Authorities were unsure how he managed to steal the M-60 tank from the armory, where 10 tanks were stored.

"He may have represented himself as a contractor," Gale said. "Someone in the Marine Corps or Army over the last 30 years would have the knowledge to disengage the safety systems."

The tank smashed through an armory gate about 6:45 p.m. and rumbled through quiet suburban neighborhoods at up to 30 mph. San Diego Gas and Electric officials said the tank bowled over power lines, knocking out electricity to about

5,100 customers in the area.

"He didn't go down the center of the street," said resident Bill Pinol. "It seems he just wanted to get the utilities and cause as much damage without hurting people."

Tanks are not uncommon on the streets surrounding the armory. "But we don't expect them to attack," said resident Ana Zaluska.

Nelson then drove onto Interstate 805 and Highway 163 before crashing into the divider, said police Capt. Skip DiCecilio.

Four officers leaped onto the tank and opened the hatch with bolt cutters as it rocked back and forth on top of the divider. They shouted at Nelson to surrender, but he tried to

get the tank moving again.

One shot was fired, and Nelson was hit in the neck, DiCecilio said. Cathy Spearnak of Sharp Memorial Hospital said Nelson died of "gun-shot wounds," but she declined to say how many times he had been hit.

Police said they didn't know whether Nelson was armed. Police wouldn't release any further details about him early today.

Hours after the tank rumbled through the neighborhoods, residents circulated outside exchanging stories and examining rows of flattened cars.

The owner of the crushed Cadillac, Tony Basurto, was watering tomatoes in his back yard when his car was flattened. "I can blame somebody — the armory, for not keeping the thing under lock and key," he said. "There's no excuse for somebody stealing a tank. How can you explain it?"

D.A.: Scout leader ran paddling club

NEW YORK (AP) — A Boy Scout leader allegedly recruited boys into his own secret club and initiated them by paddling their bare buttocks.

About 130 photographs, mostly of bruised buttocks, were found at 31-year-old David Weiser's home, Bronx District Attorney Robert Johnson said Wednesday.

Weiser was freed on his own recognition on charges of assault, hazing and child endangerment. He also was suspended as assistant leader of a Boy Scout.

Dozens of boys had to pay \$10-a-month dues to join the 5-year-old secret club, called the CB Mafia, investigators said.

'Bewitched' star dies of cancer

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Elizabeth Montgomery, who charmed 1960s television viewers as a nose-twitching suburban sorceress married to a wary mortal in "Bewitched," died Thursday after a battle with cancer. She was 57.

Montgomery died at her home surrounded by husband Robert Foxworth and her children, said family spokesman Howard Bragman. Funeral arrangements were pending.

The actress underwent surgery in April to remove a small malignant tumor.

Montgomery's post-"Bewitched" career focused on TV movies, including "Deadline for Murder," broadcast on CBS just last week. It was her second TV film based on the career of reporter Edna Buchanan.

The daughter of Hollywood star Robert Montgomery appeared in a few films in the 1950s and '60s,

including "The Court-Martial of Billy Mitchell." But television was her medium of choice. "I guess you'd say I'm a TV baby," she once told an interviewer.

"Bewitched," which ran on ABC from 1964 to 1972, was her only series. Montgomery starred as Samantha, a pretty suburban witch who, to please her advertising executive husband, tries to avoid using her powers.

Government OKs air bag cutoff switch

WASHINGTON — Automakers will be allowed to install cutoff switches for the passenger-side air bag in some vehicles, in order to prevent injury to small children in car seats.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration announced Thursday that the switches will be permitted in cars and light trucks in order to protect children in rear-facing seats.

The switches will be permitted only when the vehicle has no rear seat or the rear seat is too small to accommodate a child seat, the agency said. These include pickup trucks, sports cars and certain other passenger cars.

Clinton's AmeriCorps called 'inefficient'

WASHINGTON — President Clinton's new national service program has noble goals but is an inefficient use of federal tax money in tight times, critics told a House panel Thursday.

Much of AmeriCorps' money goes to administrative costs, asserted Allison Tucker of the Heritage Foundation, making it "nothing more than another expensive government jobs program."

And, the program may actually hurt its stated goal of encouraging young people to help others, said Tucker and other conservative critics. "But Eli Segal, whose Corporation for National and Community Service oversees AmeriCorps, said private charities have made clear "they cannot do it alone" as lawmakers shift to them more responsibility for social programs.

FDA approves immune system test

WASHINGTON — A new test may help people infected with the AIDS virus learn the health of their immune systems more quickly.

Doctors measure the progression of HIV infection by the number of vital immune cells, called CD4 cells, that are in a patient's blood. Traditionally, this is done in a very complicated procedure that is performed at just 500 laboratories around the country.

The Food and Drug Administration has approved a new test, called the TRAC CD4 Test Kit, that will allow some 3,000 laboratories to do this testing in a much simpler way, manufacturers T Cell Diagnostics said Thursday.

The old test actually separates out of blood different types of immune cells.

Senator seeks probe of base shooting

SPOKANE, Wash. — U.S. Sen. Patty Murray has written to the Department of Defense asking for a more detailed investigation into the shooting rampage at Fairchild Air Force Base last summer.

U.S. Rep. George Nethercutt, R-Wash., whose 5th Congressional District includes the base, did not sign the letter, contending it was politically motivated.

Dean Melberg killed four people and wounded 22 in the June 20 melee before he was fatally shot by a base security policeman.

Murray's letter, which was signed by a bipartisan group of House and Senate members, asks the Defense Department to explain why Melberg was allowed to stay in the military after he had been diagnosed as dangerous.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Pat Schroeder, D-Colo., was climbing the podium at ceremonies unveiling a new postage stamp commemorating women's right to vote when her beeper went off — summoning her to cast a vote in the House.

Elections show Idahoans willingly support schools

The lesson from Tuesday's election is, the system works. School districts all over Idaho asked voters for money for a variety of purposes — new buildings, additional teachers, buses, whatever. In most cases, voters decided the requests were legitimate.

In the Magic Valley, three of the four districts that asked for money Tuesday got it. Hansen will have a new high school, and Camas and Cassia schools will have extra revenue to spend.

Hansen's success may be the most significant. That tiny district will shoulder a hefty \$2.45 million in debt to build its new school. Hometown pride and hope for the future of the town's children obviously mean a lot to that small community.

The bond issue's victory does not, however, come without a certain pang of regret. Hansen had tried — and failed — to woo nearby Murtaugh into a union that could have strengthened education in both towns. Murtaugh chose to travel a solo path, and now each community is paying for construction on its own.

It's a shame. On the other hand, it's clear that both districts have been steered according to local people's wishes, and that's always a positive.

Hansen's success Tuesday — along with similar successes elsewhere in Idaho — debunks the old argument that Idaho's two-thirds majority requirement on bond issues is too stiff.

Raising taxes is supposed to be difficult; the two-thirds requirement assures that a community consensus exists before an expensive construction project begins.

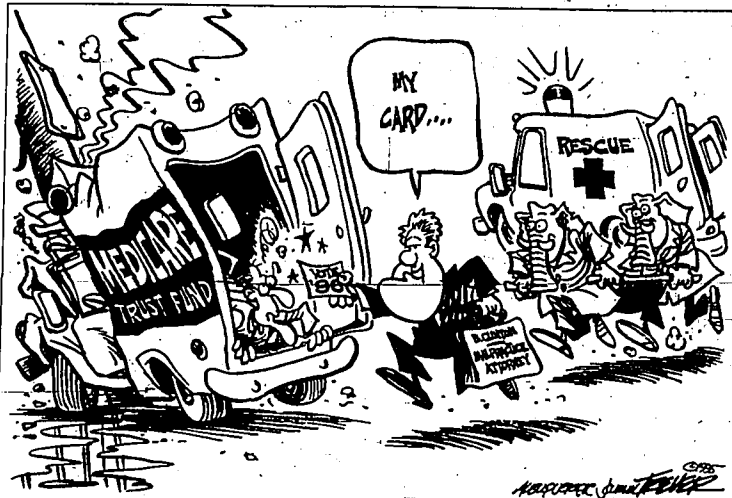
That's exactly what happened in Hansen Tuesday. It didn't happen, unfortunately, in Shoshone.

That community came up with a disappointing 13-vote deficit — evidence, apparently, that the consensus for building a new school there is not quite so solid. Shoshone will need to try again, perhaps with a modified proposal, perhaps with a more concerted effort to sell local residents on the school district's needs.

Meanwhile, all across the state, election results were overwhelmingly positive. In Blackfoot, Moscow, Genesee, Kamiah, Orofino, Rexburg and many other communities, schools asked for help and voters came through.

Of course, schools may have received a psychological boost this year from the Legislature. Gov. Phil Batt's \$40 million tax-relief plan may have put voters in a generous mood.

Voters' response Tuesday confirms the Legislature's wisdom in providing tax relief and letting citizens decide whether to spend a bit more on schools. The lesson seems to be that Idahoans want their schools to be adequately staffed, equipped and housed, and they are willing to pay reasonable taxes to see that it's done.



Today's philanthropy: New era, old trick

"This could be bigger than the (Jim) Bakker and (Jimmy) Swaggart scandals," an attorney with close ties to the philanthropic community tells me.

He's referring to the Foundation for New Era Philanthropy, an outfit that fled for bankruptcy protection last week after failing to deliver enough pots of gold to hundreds of museums, universities and religious groups that had bought heavily into its get-rich-quick scheme — only to find nothing left at the end of the rainbow.

In an alleged variation of the old pyramid game, New Era involved institutions as varied as the Academy of Natural Sciences in Philadelphia, The English Language Institute in San Dimas, Calif., and Focus on the Family, a major Christian ministry seeking greater influence within the Republican Party.

New Era said that if the organizations would invest \$500,000 in cash, they would see their money doubled, tripled, even quadrupled in six months. As my own financial advisor often says, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." One hundred to 400 percent interest on a six-month loan is too good to be true — but that didn't stop some people who should have known better.

Dr. James Dobson, president of Focus on the Family, says his organization invested \$500,000 in New Era and received \$1 million back after six months. Buoyed by such easy money, it rolled the dice a second time, putting up another \$500,000. This time it lost as New Era filed for bankruptcy protection.

tion, unable to meet the promised payments to the growing pyramid. The Wall Street Journal estimates there are 300 unsecured creditors to which New Era owes \$500 million. At least Focus on the Family broke even. Others were far less fortunate.

With refreshing candor, Dobson tells me: "He who would be rich falls into many a temptation or a snare. We should have known better. But we didn't do this without a lot of investigation. We couldn't find a flaw and suspected nothing until (New Era) started showing up everywhere."

Charles Dobson, president of Prison Fellowship, was allowed a special deal after his board refused to put up any money. His organization placed its \$500,000 in escrow until the profit was earned. Its money was protected when the pyramid crumbled.

New Era's chief executive, John G. Bennett, apparently knew all the right moves to gain the trust of nonprofit organizations. People who met him say he didn't drive an expensive car or wear flashy suits. And he persuaded talented and educated people that several anonymous donors were backing New Era so there was nothing to worry about. Bennett recently acknowledged that

the donors do not exist. What astounding lies so many evangelical Christian organizations could be duped. It's estimated as many as 120 of them had entrusted more than \$100 million to New Era. Apparently they ignored not only biblical proverbs about usury, but also an English proverb that admonishes, "A fool and his money are soon parted."

This latest financial scandal affecting people who should know that "the love of money is the root of all evil" ought to prove again their fund-raising appeals grows increasingly apocalyptic as they vie to shake loose dollars that go into a seemingly bottomless pit.

When a crippled beggar outside the walls of Jerusalem's Old City asked the Apostles Peter and John for money, Peter replied, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I give you." And they bid the man, in the name of Christ, to get up and walk.

Here's a message that Christian ministries, which may be the biggest victims of New Era, should heed. It appears that money has become a problem for many of them, eclipsing their purpose and diluting the power of their message. Perhaps this shock will bring them to their senses.

Why was dairy petition ignored?

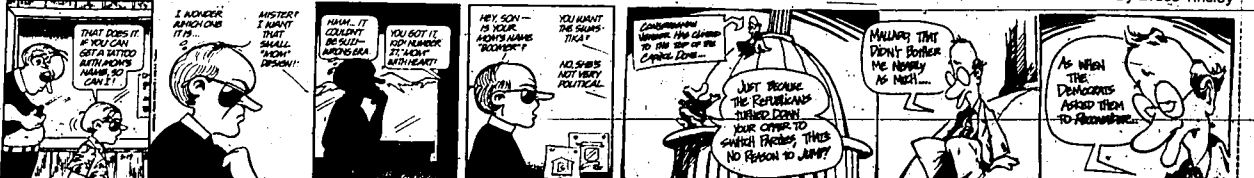

Police find nerve gas ingredients

TOKYO (AP) -- The self-styled messiah who police believe was behind the Tokyo subway attack hinted Thursday he may try to shift the blame for the deadly poisoning away from himself.

Yet even as cult leader Shoko Asahara was making his first court appearance, newspapers reported that police had found a sealed underground chamber at his rural hideout with yet another huge cache of nerve gas ingredients.

Asahara's hearing was closed to the public. Although the courthouse is only 40 yards from police headquarters, the guru was driven there in a police van, his usual purple robes replaced by a grey, prison-issue sweatshirt.

Police held back more than 300 reporters and photographers pressed up against a fence.

Asahara, arrested Tuesday, was bound over for at least 10 more days of interrogation. Police have another three weeks before they have to charge him.

On Wednesday, Asahara had insisted to a lawyer that neither he nor his followers had made nerve gas, and said police were trying to frame him in the March 20 gas attack, which killed a dozen people and sickened 5,500.

Meanwhile, the cult promised Thursday to abandon its "scientific research activities," which apparently had included the manufacturing of nerve gas.

Cult spokesman Fumihiko Joyu said the cult would only continue "necessary functions" such as training and feeding its followers.

In questioning before Thursday's court session, Asahara indicated he was worried. "What will happen to me?" he asked plaintively, according to investigators.

He also suggested that he was unaware of everything his estimated 10,000 followers were up to, providing a hint of how he may defend himself against charges of masterminding the attack.

"Do you know what all of your underlings are doing?" media reports quoted him as asking his interrogators. "I have so many followers, it's impossible for me to know what everybody is doing."

The turnaround came amid indications that Asahara's top lieutenants are now pointing the finger at their leader. His jailed deputies are telling police he ordered the subway attack, media reports say.

Police suspect Asahara ordered more than 40 followers of his Aum Shinri Kyo (Supreme Truth) sect to carry out the gas attack. They have obtained arrest warrants for 41 cult members suspected of direct involvement, and say they now have arrested all but seven.

France's new Cabinet includes more women

PARIS (AP) — The new Cabinet named Thursday includes a record number of women, an Olympic hurdles champion and some tongue-twisting new portfolios reflecting France's complex social problems.

There is a minister for Solidarity Between Generations, another for Neighborhoods in Difficulty, a third for integration and the Fight Against Exclusion.

But behind the awkward-sounding names is a clear signal from the new president, Jacques Chirac, and his premier, Alain Juppé, that they are ready to experiment as they work to reduce unemployment and ease social tensions.

"We're going to get to work very quickly and strongly," Juppé said in a radio interview. "This is a declaration of war against unemployment."

He said "concrete measures" would be proposed next week, probably dealing with incentives to businesses to hire long-term unemployed people.

Though both leaders are from the conservative Rally for the Republic party, their government will be

assessed by the public on its ability to carry out at least some of the sweeping proposals Chirac made during the election campaign.

Chirac, elected May 7 and inaugurated Wednesday, will preside over the Cabinet's first meeting Saturday.

Next week, he will get to work on his first priority — developing jobs programs to reduce the 12.2 percent unemployment rate.

The new socially oriented portfolios are targeted at a phenomenon that the French call "exclusion" — the sense of alienation felt by the unemployed, the homeless, the poor, and immigrants, especially from North Africa.

The 42-member Cabinet includes 12 women, 3 reelected, although eight of them are junior ministers. The Cabinet's average age is 48 — four years younger than its predecessor.

Chirac had vowed the votes of women and youth during the campaign by promising them greater representation in government.

The youngest junior minister is François Baroin, 29, who will serve as Cabinet spokesman.

Good future promised for Hong Kong

HONG KONG (AP) — China assured Hong Kong on Thursday that it would not do away with its civil service, capitalist system and freedom of travel after the British colony reverts to Chinese rule in 1997.

Lu Ping, Beijing's top official for Hong Kong affairs, gave the reassurances at a seminar highlighting the quickening pace of Chinese preparations for the handover.

Since arriving Monday, Lu has been involved in a dispute over his refusal to meet Gov. Chris Patten, whom China reviles for democratizing Hong Kong's electoral system.

But Lu appeared Thursday to lay the dispute to rest, saying he did not want to engage in megaphone diplomacy, and his address was notable for its detail and soothing tone.

He started with the Court of Final Appeal, planned as a safeguard of the freedoms the colony now enjoys, and finished by reiterating China's pledge to uphold Hong Kong's capitalist system for at least 50 years.

The Hong Kong government said it welcomed Lu's "very general assurances," but asked him to be more specific — especially on when China experts to approve plans for the appeals court.

Lu said foreign judges could sit on the court — an important encouragement for people who fear Chinese judges may be biased.

But Lu made clear that the court would not have a say on issues that

Beijing considers its preserve, such as picking Hong Kong's top civil servants.

On another issue of concern — freedom of travel — Lu described the passport Hong Kong Chinese will carry, and assured those who have emigrated that they will suffer no ill will if they return.

Lu also praised Hong Kong's 180,000 civil servants as an asset that China wants to preserve after 1997, even if they have British nationality.

The seminar's focus — Hong Kong's role as a financial hub — was reflected in the guest list, which included heads of the Bank of Tokyo, the Bank of China and Hong Kong's de facto central bank.

Epidemic response criticized

KINSHASA, Zaire (AP) — A leading virologist criticized the government's response to the Ebola epidemic, saying Thursday roadblocks and quarantines were a waste of valuable time in the race to contain the killer virus.

Instead of putting more soldiers on the highway to prevent stricken people from traveling, more doctors and equipment should be sent to the disease's epicenter, said Dr. Jean-Jacques Muyembe Kintun, who helped identify the Ebola 19 virus years ago.

"The quarantine and the roadblocks are neither necessary nor effective, and more attention should be turned to prevention," Muyembe said.

Information would stop the rumors that have sent people who fear they have the disease into hiding, he said. Roadblocks, by contrast, create conditions ripe for a new outbreak.

Muyembe said 3,000 people trying to reach Kinshasa from Kikwit, the city of 600,000 where the epidemic broke out, have been camped out at the final roadblock for several days with little food or water — fertile ground for the virus.

Furthermore, anyone with enough money — \$550, according to a car rental agency in Kinshasa — can bribe their way through the roadblocks, Muyembe told a news conference in Kikwit.

And people sick with Ebola were generally too disoriented and weak to travel long distances, making the quarantine largely unnecessary, Muyembe said. His comments were transmitted by radio to Kinshasa, 250 miles west.

So far, no Ebola cases have been diagnosed in Kinshasa, the capital of about 6 million people. In Kikwit, at least 114 people have been infected and five new cases are appearing daily, Muyembe said. So far, 79 people have died.

He urged the government to begin a radio and television campaign to explain how the virus is transmitted — through blood and the traditional washing of infected corpses — and to encourage people with symptoms to report to health authorities.

Health experts say fear of the disease could fuel its spread because people, afraid of going to the Kikwit hospital where many people have died, are staying home and spreading the infection.

"It's a more difficult environment to control now. We could have as many as 120 new cases in the next 10 days if we don't get a grip on it," said Larry Shieh, who is coordinating investigators who are searching for victims by car, motorcycle and bicycle.

"When you have an epidemic of disease, you have two other epidemics — panic and rumors," said a WHO spokesman, Igor Rozov. "At the same time, we try to fight the disease, we also must fight the others, and it's not easy."

Composer Haydn's manuscript sells for record \$1.04 million

LONDON (AP) — A draft of four string quartets by Franz Joseph Haydn, kept under a bed by an Australian woman, fetched a record \$1.04 million at Sotheby's Thursday.

The working draft for the String Quartets, Opus 50, numbers 3, 4, 5 and 6, published in 1787, was bought by a German antiquarian book dealer, Hans Schneider of Tutzing, near Munich.

The seller, a Melbourne woman who asked not to be identified, said an English ancestor who was a retired colonel bought the draft in 1851 at a London auction — apparently as an investment — before emigrating to Australia.

The family stored it under a bed for safekeeping.

Scholars thought it was lost until the woman showed it to experts at a Haydn festival in 1982, and then put it in a bank vault.

Sotheby's said the previous highest price paid for a manuscript by the 18th century composer was \$219,800 in 1993 for six pages of Haydn's unfinished last quartet.

The seller said she will use the money to set up a trust to help talented young musicians.

Dancer, actor Alexander Godunov dies at age 45

NEW YORK (AP) — Alexander Godunov, the ballet dancer who defected from the Soviet Union and went on to act in such movies as "Witness" and "Die Hard," has died at 45, his publicists said Thursday.

Friends of Godunov confirmed his death, but details on where, when and how he died were not immediately known, spokeswoman Joanne Burnside said.

Godunov came to the United States in 1979 after spending 10 years with the Bolshoi Ballet. He

joined the American Ballet Theater in New York, dancing there for the next three years.

The tall, lean dancer with long, straight (foxen hair appeared on his own TV show, "Godunov: The World to Dance In," in 1983-84 before starting his acting career as an Amish farmer in the Harrison Ford thriller "Witness" in 1985.

His other movie roles included a supercilious conductor in "The Music Pit" with Tom Hanks, and a psychotic killer opposite Bruce Willis in "Die Hard."

Dump salmon plan, panel told

STANLEY — People here aren't willing to accept the demise of Idaho's endangered salmon, so federal officials should scrap their business-as-usual plan to save endangered fish.

"While they're at it, National Marine Fisheries Service officials should stop defending cheap hydro-electricity."

Time after time, speakers hammered those themes at Thursday's public hearing on the federal agency's plan to save Snake

Keep flushing — B4

River sockeye and chinook salmon.

"This recovery plan ... is a pathway to extinction," Sun Valley physician Steve Pauley said. Federal officials "are willing to trade 100 million year of (salmon) evolution for a few megawatts of power."

"Your new plan offers no significant change in what you've been doing for 10 years," said Stanley dam sufferer, Randy Hix. "Either fix the dam, or admit that you don't give a damn."

He and others urged federal officials to focus on the federal dams on the lower Snake and Columbia rivers instead of land use restrictions in Idaho.

Hailey architect Jon Marvel urged Fisheries Service officials to focus on the hydroelectric industry and subsidized consumers like aluminum manufacturers.

More than 130 people crowded into the Stanley Community Center to cheer as speakers blasted the federal salmon plan, which was released March 24.

Not everyone espoused a salmon-over-

economy sentiment.

"To lose any, even one, existing job in this effort is offensive to me," said the evening's first speaker, state Rep. Lenore Hix. "I'm R. Chaffin."

But she was in the minority. Many of the other speakers urged

Medicare talk worries elderly

Seniors around the valley say look elsewhere to work on balanced budget

GOODING — When 82-year-old widow Grace Jacobs needed to fix her house's roof, she had to cash a bond and work out a payment arrangement with a lumber company.

After working for about 40 years, she now relies on Social Security and Medicare. She lives frugally on her Social Security pension, and she doesn't know what she would do if she had to pay more for health-care coverage.

But Jacobs and other Medicare recipients may have to.

As House members Thursday debated and approved a resolution to balance the federal budget by 2002, Jacobs and other Magic Valley residents lunching and socializing at various senior citizen centers, shared their views on possible changes in Medicare.

"I don't think they should balance it at the expense of the seniors because most of us have paid our dues very well and long," said 69-year-old Nicki Harchuck of Gooding. Harchuck lives on a Social Security pension and receives both Medicare and Medicaid.

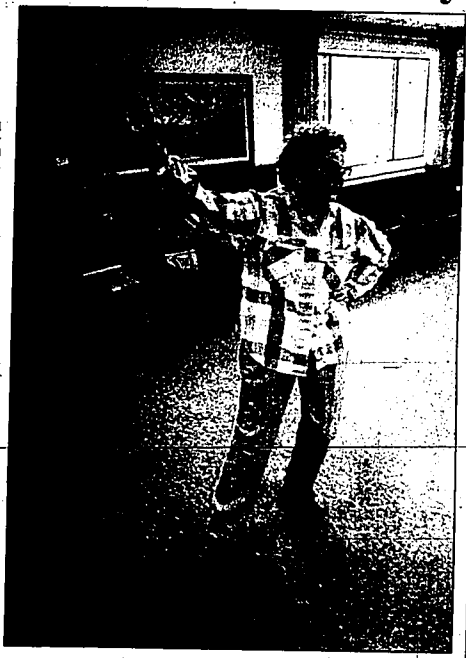
Jacobs said she would think twice about going to the doctor if she knew she may have to pay more — as Congress is considering having Medicare recipients do.

"I'd just keep putting it off as long as I could. Most of the time it costs more than if we just went from the start," she said.

Jacobs buys supplemental insurance to pick up what her current Medicare coverage doesn't. "It's awfully expensive — \$110 a month — but I got it if I need it," she said.

Seniors such as 78-year-old Roberta Harding of Jerome — who was getting ready Thursday for an aerobics class she said helps keep her healthy — said those living on fixed incomes such as Jacobs and Harchuck would be the worst hurt by Medicare changes. But even seniors with other pensions and income could be affected, seniors said.

"I suppose I could stand it, but a lot of people don't have much income above their Social Security," Harding said. "If

they cut it too much, I'd notice it, too."

Doctors also have concerns about Medicare's future.

With an already limited number of doctors who take cookies — or any —

Medicare patients, more doctors probably will stop taking Medicare recipients, said Burley internist Dr. Charles W. Suits.

Minidoka officers nab drug haul from home near elementary school

ACEQUIA — Following an undercover buy, police arrested a woman with a house full of drugs less than 100 feet from an elementary school.

Sandra Perez Cantu, 34, was taken away by Minidoka County Sheriff's Department Capt. Randy White on charges

of delivering a methamphetamine, controlled substance.

Further charges are pending against Cantu and others involved in the drug dealing operation, Sheriff Paul Fries said.

Drugs with a street value between \$15,000 and \$20,000 were taken out of Cantu's A-frame house across the street from the Acequia School.

More than seven pounds of marijuana, mostly packaged in plastic bags stuffed into a brown, vinyl du-

fel bag, were taken from Cantu's home. One hundred grams of cocaine and 32 grams of methamphetamine were also found.

Police also took a .22-caliber handgun from the house.

Cantu offered no resistance when police entered her home shortly after 8:30 a.m., Fries said.

Members of the Minidoka County Sheriff's Department Special Response Team and the Rupert Police drug dog, Buddy, searched the house.

Police intended to enter the house earlier, but delayed the bust to allow school buses to unload children, Fries said.

Acequia School Principal Lew Roberts said he was aware of the police activity and kept students and faculty indoors and out of the line of fire.

"We could have been in danger here," Roberts said. "I'm glad they waited."

"I'm glad to see our sheriff's department and county officials act quickly on things like this, especially when it's that close to the school," Roberts added.

Fries said he will ask prosecutors to make note of Cantu's proximity to the school while dealing drugs.

"There are additional penalties for selling within a distance of the school," he said.

Cantu's drug house was apparently an independent operation and was not connected with a recent methamphetamine lab discovered in Burley, Fries said.

Idaho forests should burn less, but rangeland could burn more

BOISE (AP) — This year's plentiful snowpack and heavy spring rains should reduce the chances of serious fires this summer on Idaho forests, but not on the range, experts predict.

Fires burned about 500,000 acres in the Boise and Payette national forests last summer. But this year snow piled up in the mountains and was topped off by more spring rain than usual.

That means the timber and brush in the mountains will stay moist longer and not be so vulnerable to fire so soon. That should make for a shorter fire season.

Last summer, the Boise National Forest was drying out by mid-June, said Phil Morrissey of the Natural Resource Conservation Service.

"Even if we have a hot, dry summer this year, it should be until mid-July before it dries out," Morrissey said.

The snowpack in the Boise River basin is 150 percent of normal and the Payette basin is 135 percent. This time last year, the Boise snowpack was 21 percent of normal, and the Payette was 11 percent.

"The fire season looks now like it will be much less active than last year," said Rick Ochoa, weather forecaster for the National Interagency Fire Center in Boise.

But the Bureau of Land Management is below with its normal crews for larger range fires than last year. In 1994, a record-normal 154,000 acres burned on BLM land in Idaho.

"At the end of June or July, when the fuel moisture goes down, we could be in a very dangerous situation," said spokesman Jack Seppi.

"We're growing fuel like crazy." The wet winter and spring is spurring growth of highly flammable vegetation, like cheat grass.

Despite the reduced threat to forests, the Boise National Forest will maintain normal firefighting crews.

"We may have more fires than last year, but I don't think we'll burn as many acres," said Steve Raddatz, the forest's fire manager.

The National Weather Service forecasts above-normal precipitation in Idaho through July, and near-normal levels for August through October.

Lance says feds bring on criticism

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — The bombing of an Oklahoma City federal building was a cowardly act of terrorism, Attorney General John D. Ashcroft said, but the federal government has brought the district on itself.

"We have a powderkeg in the United States and especially in the western United States," Lance said Wednesday at a Bonneville County Republican women's meeting. "We in the West have just about had enough of the arrogance of the federal government."

Lance also said the Blackfoot-based U.S. Militia Association does not sound like a hometeam, so he hopes to find the time to mend their relationship.

"I'd be happy to meet with them sometime," he said.

But while Lance was willing to explain the bombing, Republican U.S. Rep. Michael Crapo made no rush to judgment Wednesday. It's too early to look for reasons behind the April 19 blast that killed 167 people, the 2nd District congressman said Wednesday night.

"Frankly, I think we make a little bit of a mistake in our society if we start trying to extrapolate too much from Oklahoma," Crapo said during a cable television show across the state.

Federal investigators have blamed the bombing on right-wing activists, with alleged ties to a Michigan militia group.

Lance offered a list of reasons for Idahoans should be skeptical of the federal government, focusing on Randy Weaver's armed standoff at Ruby Ridge.

He criticized the government's handling of the fatal 1992 encounter in northern Idaho where he killed Weaver's wife and son.

Federal agents who were repatriated for their role in the standoff were suspended with pay or given a "paid fishing trip," he said. Lance would not rule out seeking charges against federal agents.

"Their pockets are a lot deeper than ours," Lance said of federal agents.

In his anti-federal theme, Lance criticized plans to send another 1,500 nuclear warshipments to the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, even though he said the shipments would be safe and would create jobs in eastern Idaho. He said it was a case of state sovereignty.

"Having it forced down my throat doesn't sit well with me," Lance said.

He also criticized the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for sending armed agents to a Salmon-area ranch to investigate the shooting death of an federally protected grizzly bear.

Lance said he does not "philosophically agree" with the idea of voluntary, private militia groups. But he is willing to meet with the U.S. Militia Association.

Militia leaders have criticized Lance for twice breaking appointments to speak at their meetings.

The conservative Phil Bart has flatly refused to recognize a state militia. Lance said he has not reviewed the law.

Physicians reject cuts in paybacks

POCATELLO (AP) — Bannock County will continue to reimburse physicians 50 cents on the dollar for indigent patients after the doctors rejected its proposed 40-cent payback.

For more than a decade, Bannock County has paid physicians half of their normal bill for indigents with medical problems. It has worked out well — until now.

This year, the county's medical assistance funds are short of cash because of higher health care costs and the number of the poor asking for help.

Bannock County indigent services director Karen Johnson in March asked 40 local physicians to consider taking 40 percent instead of the usual 50 percent. Seven of the eight doctors who responded declined.

For now, the county will leave the reimbursement rate at 50 cents on the dollar.

According to a county audit, Johnson's department had already spent 88.7 percent of its budget for doctors' services in the first seven months of the fiscal year.

Idaho law requires counties to pay doctors at least a minimum rate, set by Medicaid. The problem with Medicaid, Johnson said, is that different procedures are paid at different rates.

Rather than calculating the separate rates, Bannock County simply pays half of what the doctors charge.

Four responses came from the Pocatello Clinic of Internal Medicine. Cancer specialist Dr. Fred Hyde said administrative and overhead costs represent half of his billing. In effect, he said, doctors receive no earnings at all.

"We are willing to see indigent patients and receive no (remuneration), but we are not willing to further subsidize the care of indigent patients by actually contributing an additional 10 percent to their care," Hyde wrote.

Dr. Darrell B. Cook, a gastroenterologist, said fee simply didn't want to encourage the county to lower the compensation rate.

"It's really bizarre that they sent out a letter that asked if I'd like less pay," Cook said.

Tom Williams, Family Practice Group office manager, said he had no problem with the decrease, adding doctors in his group feel lucky to be reimbursed at all.

"Because of the government's lack of funds, we were willing to take the 40 percent. If we didn't have that, we probably would get nothing," Williams said. "Most of the people are unemployed. I think there has to be a time for sacrifice and compassion in order to care for our people."

Other southeastern Idaho counties have chosen to pay both doctors and hospitals at Medicaid rates.

Phone problems raise concerns about emergency response time

MOSCOW (AP) — A telephone company and a radio station are pointing fingers at one another as the source of phone service problems that many fear could delay emergency response.

During afternoon periods of peak phone use, callers here sometimes experience delays in getting dial tones. The delays usually last only a few seconds, and service is normal once dial tone sounds.

Officials believe the delays have not caused problems with 911 or other emergency calls so far. But a problem is certain to occur sooner or later before something is done, said Will Simpson, a spokesman for Grisman Medical Center.

Sgt. Neil Odenberg said police are concerned about the problem.

GTE, the area's phone-service provider, says the source of the problem

is KZFN, an FM radio station that holds popular afternoon call-in contests.

The contests mean high phone volume during peak hours and overload the system, causing the dial-tone delays, GTE spokesman Bob Wyatt said. GTE has asked the station not to hold the contests during peak hours.

"The police are still able to get 911 calls during the delays, but if residents can't get a dial tone, they can't call for help," Wyatt said.

The station has scaled back its contests in response to GTE's request. But KZFN has refused to change the times for the contests, saying the events must take place during peak listening times if they are to be successful.

Dennis Deccio, the station's general manager, said KZFN couldn't possibly be overloading the phone system on its own and said GTE should update its equipment.

Democrats will use caucuses to pick delegates

BOISE (AP) — The process for picking Idaho's delegates to the 1996 Democratic National Convention will start next March 5.

State Democratic Chairman Bill Monk said Thursday county caucuses will be held that evening in all 44 counties. Delegates elected at county caucuses will be proportionately later before selecting presidential candidates according to the number of people who show up.

The 382 delegates elected at county caucuses will attend the state Democratic convention in Boise June 20-23. At the state convention Idaho's 24 delegate and four alternates will be picked for the national convention opening Aug. 26 at Chicago.

Monk said the Democratic delegate selection plan allows any Democratic voter in the state to take part.

"The Democratic Party has always had a policy of inclusion and not exclusion," he said.

Teachers decline tentative agreement

SHELLEY (AP) — Congratulations came early in the Shelley School District when it announced a tentative agreement was reached between administrators and the teachers' union.

On May 9, it appeared the yearlong contract dispute was over. The school board unanimously accepted the deal on Friday, but teachers voted Monday to reject it.

"All I know is that they did not ratify that agreement, and it was their own error, and they turned back. Superintendent Bob Lisonbee said.

The Shelley contract dispute is stuck on how best to spend unexpected state money. Since 1981, the district has received \$221,000 from the state in unanticipated revenue and given 70 percent to the teachers to divide among themselves. School officials want that arrangement out of the contract, but teacher negotiators want it to stay.

The teachers' refusal to ratify the contract is more evidence of district's embroiled state. Once before, the two sides reached a tentative agreement, but it was never approved by the school board.

In recent weeks, the teachers union has blacked out the district and given Lisonbee a vote of no-confidence, and the Shelley School Board demanded public apologies from the teachers involved.

Former rancher acquitted of rustling

TWIN FALLS — A former Castleford rancher was acquitted of a cattle-rustling charge Thursday.

William Brown, of Twin Falls, had been charged with stealing 54 cattle from Andrea and Leonard Olmstead and trying to sell the cattle at a Jerome sale yard.

Brown's lawyer, Monte Carlson, argued that his client isn't a criminal and should be hushed out of the cattle dispute in civil court. Two other felonies against Brown were dismissed in December.

Brown's wife, Barbara, said Thursday she was relieved by the jury's decision, and is pursuing a civil suit against the Olmsteads. She said the Olmsteads were co-owners of the ranch, and they refused to pay the Browns for leasing cattle, so they could foreclose the Castleford ranch and take over ownership.

She said they also have filed liens against the Olmsteads demanding more than \$70,000 in back payments from them.

"We lost everything because of this," Barbara Brown said. The Olmsteads could not be reached for comment Thursday.

Defense resumes attack on DNA

LOS ANGELES — As prosecutors heaped new statistical evidence atop their mounting case against O.J. Simpson, defense lawyers Thursday resumed their attack on damaging DNA tests, saying the results were tainted by sloppy evidence-handling practices.

DNA analyst Gary Sims ended three days of prosecution testimony with a bang, giving jurors even more astronomical odds linking Simpson to the June 12 murders of his ex-wife and her waiter friend.

Sims told jurors that the combination of "genetic markers" found on a pair of bloodstained socks recovered from Simpson's bedroom — and matching his ex-wife's blood type — were shared by just 1 in 7.7 billion whites and 1 in 21 billion African Americans.

Sims said the odds were based on six separate genetic tests performed by the California state DNA lab, where he works. Additional tests performed by Cellmark Diagnostics, a private lab, made the odds even longer, he said, identifying other genetic markers shared by as few as 1 in 6 million people.

"This profile is a rare event," said Sims, who over the last three days has given prosecutors their strongest evidence yet linking Simpson to the murders of Nicole Simpson and Ronald Lyle Goldman.

Before turning Sims over to defense attorneys, prosecutor Rockne Harmon tried to anticipate the defense attack, pointing out that Sims' was "part of some conspiracy to frame the defendant in this case."

But perhaps because the defense has behaved that accusation at so

Forensic scientist Gary Sims testified that odds were 240,000-to-1 that blood found near the bodies of Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman came from a black person other than O.J. Simpson. He put chances at 21 billion-to-1 that a blood stain on a sock found in Simpson's bedroom came from a white person other than Ms. Simpson.

Sims, questioned by prosecutor Rockne Harmon, said a study showed sweat dandruff or spit from lab technicians couldn't contaminate a DNA sample, but results could be skewed if two wet blood swatches were stored touching.

The judge barred Gale Holland of USA Today and Kristin Jeannette-Meyers of Court TV from the courtroom after two jurors complained they were distracted by the journalists' whispering.

many prosecution witnesses, Harmon misspoke, calling Sims "Mr. Matheson," referring to Gregory Matheson, the chief chemist at the Los Angeles police lab.

Sims laughed. "My name is Sims, and no, I'm not," he replied.

Harmon's slip turned out to be prophetic.

For as defense attorney Barry Schack began his cross-examination, the defense turned again to its standard themes of corruption and contamination.

And the target was not Sims but police technicians, who Schack said had so mishandled evidence that jurors should disregard the myriad DNA tests.

While acknowledging the careful procedures used in Sims' lab, Schack suggested that police technicians had not followed the same rigid standards, inadvertently contaminating dozens of evidence samples.

"With respect to the biological material that you tested, you do not know how any of the biological material got on those items, do you?" Schack asked.

Sims conceded.

Schack then launched into a series of mistakes that, he said, had degraded the blood evidence in the case and allowed Simpson's DNA to come into contact with bloodstains gathered at the murder scene, creating "false matches" implicating him in the crimes.

"Let's talk small here," Schack said, seeking to underscore how little Simpson's DNA would have had to be mishandled to create a "false match" linking him to the murder scene. "A nanogram is a billionth of a gram. So what's a picogram?"

"That's a trillionth of a gram," Sims said, adding that his lab could get a DNA result with as little as 300 picograms of genetic material.

"Could you see that with the naked eye?" Schack said.

"I think it would be visible," Sims said. "But it would be a speck."

As Schack warmed to a new attack, Judge Lance Ito cracked down on an unruly gallery, banishing from court two reporters who had disrupted jurors by whispering. He said the reporters — Kristin Jeannette-Meyers of Court-TV and Gail Holland of USA Today — would be barred from the courtroom for the remainder of the trial.

Later, in a written order, Ito made public two notes he received from jurors Thursday, one complaining that Jeannette-Meyers and Holland, who sit together near the jury box, had been "constantly hysping" for two days, "which distracts my attention."

Ito's ban affects only the individuals, not their news organizations, which will continue to cover the trial.

Earlier in the day, Harmon told jurors that evidence contamination while always a concern with small biological samples — was not as big a danger as the defense contends.

In one study, cited by Harmon and Sims, two scientists deliberately tried to create contamination by coughing and scratching their head over a vial of blood, to no avail.

Harmon also told jurors that there was no way for Simpson's blood to have come in contact with evidence samples, which were stored in separate envelopes inside paper "hulders" in the police crime-lab.

"Can DNA fly?" Harmon asked facetiously. "Does the DNA of an athletic person that's in a stain have any athletic prowess more than a dead person?" Are you aware of any scientific studies that show that DNA can come in the air to light?"

Sims laughed, even if most jurors didn't, he said.

Minidoka's gifted program expands

RUPERT — The Minidoka School Board at this week's meeting approved the hiring of another facilitator for the district's gifted and talented program.

"What we are trying to do is find a way to provide opportunities to these special people," Assistant Superintendent Richard Goodworth said.

As Goodworth sees it, it's not just the learning disabled students who have special needs. Bright students also have to be given attention.

In fact, each student can be "turned off" if they have nothing but regular school programs to attend, and that can lead to the students eventually dropping out of school, Goodworth said.

Mary Null, who works with the program, has been aiming for a "service classroom" in the district to serve as a center for gifted and talented programs.

Because of budgeting difficulties, the district instead wants to have two such classrooms, one at Big Valley Elementary and the other at either Paul or Heyburn elementary schools.

Though the district doesn't have a large enough budget to finance all of Null's desires for the gifted and talented program, Goodworth said a \$3,000 budget, plus a \$4,200 budget allotment and paying the salary of the other facilitator, is a good start.

The facilitators will mainly work with gifted and talented students, who meet certain criteria, in the third through sixth grades.

But Null said younger students might also participate in the program.

"Catch them when they're young," Null said.

The district will soon begin its search for the new facilitator.

The board approved raising elementary school activity fees from \$5 to \$7. Principals said one of the reasons for the increase is the rising cost of assemblies.

Wildlife officials move wolf, pup into park

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, Wyo. (AP) — The Yellowstone National Park wolf pup birth to eight pups on a ranch near Red Lodge, Mont., earlier this month was captured and moved back into the park Thursday.

U.S. Fish and Wildlife spokesman Mike Smith said in a release that the pup was captured on Sunday that the wolf and her pups would have a better chance of survival in the park than on the private land, which is near restaurants, other ranches, hotels and other sources of human activity.

Smith said biologists on Tuesday set specially designed snares to trap the adult wolf without hurting her. One of the snares set an electronic signal to biologists that the wolf was trapped shortly after 4 a.m. Thursday.

"The area where she had the pups was not the

best for them to learn how to be wolves," said Ed Bangs, head of the agency's wolf reintroduction program. "With the added stress associated with single parenthood, this was not the most desirable of situations."

Biologists have been bringing elk and deer meat to the female and her pups. She has not been able to leave the pups to hunt for herself because her mate was killed in late April.

The male's radio tracking collar was found April 27 near Red Lodge, and its skinned carcass was found May 7.

A 42-year-old unemployed carpenter from Red Lodge was charged earlier this week with a misdemeanor violation of violating the Endangered Species Act. Federal authorities in Montana said Chad McKittrick had admitted to shooting the wolf and keeping its head and skin in his house.

The wolves were among the 14 Canadian wolves brought to Yellowstone in January as part of the federal government's reintroduction program. Another 15 wolves were released in a wilderness area in central Idaho.

Bangs said the wolf and her pups initially will be kept in the one-acre acclimation pen where they spent their first six weeks in the park. Lamar Valley. He said because the wolf has not established her territory in the park, biologists feared other wolves may threaten the pups.

Bangs also said the capture and relocation of the female and her pups was a highly unusual action dictated by circumstances.

"In this instance, we determined that human assistance was warranted," he said. "This may indicate a pattern of action for any other occurrences where wolves have pups outside the park."

Sixty percent to 70 percent of Suits' patients are Medicare recipients, he said, and his office is reimbursed 65 percent to 80 percent of normal fees for those patients. And many Medicare recipients already can't pay their share of bills, he said.

"We write off a tremendous amount every year with folks who can't pay their share of bills," Suits said.

He says an outside company about \$3,000 a year to help keep his office updated on Medicare changes. While one form covers billing for Medicare patients, the average Medicare patient requires about seven forms, Suits said.

Privatizing Medicare and putting the program under the auspices of an agency such as Blue Cross or Blue Shield is the best way to control Medicare costs, he said.

"They waste a huge amount on administration," Suits said. "They're a real hassle to deal with." The federal deficit does need to be reduced, said John Carpenter of Wendell and other seniors. But shifting more of a burden on the elderly isn't reasonable, they said.

"If all of our government — congressmen, senators and so on and so forth — had to live under the same situation that the little John Does have to live with, they'd be a little more realistic," Carpenter said.

Focusing on Medicare

The House Budget Committee last week outlined three strategies to overhaul some of the Medicare programs of those strategies reported by the Associated Press include:

- Giving seniors incentives to enroll in managed-care plans, such as health maintenance organizations, and doubling the annual \$100 deductible for doctor and outpatient services over two years.

- This strategy includes boosting premiums for some recipients and eventually converting Medicare to a voucher system.

- Going immediately to a universal medical voucher for private coverage. Beneficiaries would pay more for expensive coverage but get a rebate if they don't spend the voucher's full amount. Vouchers would be adjusted based on age, gender, location and disability status.

- A plan combining \$178 billion in savings from providers and beneficiaries with an automatic mechanism to trigger \$101 billion in additional savings if the shift to privatize Medicare failed to save that much.

Operating other dams to mimic the high, fast water conditions of spring.

Spilling water and smolts over the top of dams, rather than through hydroelectric turbines, is essential, they said. Reducing the amount of water stored behind dams in the spring — a process known as drawdown — was another key component stressed by speakers.

Only 30 percent of the Columbia and Snake rivers between the dams and the Pacific flows freely; the other 70 percent is held behind dams.

Stanley-area resident Bob Grovel said salmon smolts should be left in the river because the "tech-no-fix" strategy of trucking and barging hasn't worked. For in-river migration to succeed, river operations along the Snake and Columbia will have to change — and some people will be inconvenienced, he said.

Rob Jones, Portland, Ore.-based regional recovery plan coordinator for the Fisheries Service, noted that 50 species of Pacific salmon have already gone extinct — and another 50 are teetering on the brink. Last year was a record low year for adult Snake River salmon returns, he said, but this year is expected to be even worse.

Ap efforts in salmon restoration plan is expected to take four or five generations, or about 24 years, he said.

Another public hearing on the federal salmon plan will be held June 21 in Idaho Falls. Written comments will be accepted through July 17, and the final version will be released late this year.

"No one will lose his or her life" in order to save salmon, said Larry Barnes. America is one of the wealthiest nations on earth, "and this argument to not save the salmon because we'll lose a few jobs is tragic."

County expands stock allotment

SPOKANE (AP) — Despite objections from the state Department of Ecology, the Spokane County Commission upped from one to three the number of large farm animals that can be kept on an acre of dry land.

The county already allows three head of livestock on an acre of irrigated land, which usually has plenty of grass to help prevent erosion and keep down dust.

Until Tuesday, the limit for an acre of non-irrigated land was one horse, cow or other large animal.

County planner Wally Hubbard said the regulation was almost impossible to enforce.

"Somebody puts a garden hose out there and calls it irrigated," he said.

Allowing more animals on small, dry lots will kick up the dust, said Vernice Santee of the Ecology Department.

The drama of it all

TFHS students end year with 2 bangs

TWIN FALLS—The Twin Falls High School Drama Department's grand finale of the year is a grab bag of entertainment.

The students are presenting two one-act plays, one a serious drama and one a black comedy. In between, there will be a poetic monologue and a dramatic reading of a humorous essay.

The first play, "Not My Cup of Tea," by A. F. Groff, is about two daughters conspiring to kill their mother. It's the comedy.

There are three roles in the play.

Mother, "80, grey-haired, hard of hearing and lazier," is played by Mindy Fry. Emmie, "small, sweet, 58 and almost brainless," is played by Anna Graybill. Jessica, "Emmie's sister, domineering, about 60," is played by Becky DuResne.

"When she comes in, you ask her which way she would prefer to die if she had a choice," Jessica instructs Emmie, "by poisoning or by being shot."

The daughters are quite the compassionate duo, always keeping their mother's preferences in mind.

The same three students play the main roles in "Haiku," by Katherine Snodgrass. This play is about an autistic girl, Louise (Mindy), and her mother, Nell (Anna) and sister Billy (Becky).

To play her part, Mindy said, she had to learn to stare a lot, repeat a lot, roll her eyes and rock. She's seen autistic children, she said, but it's difficult to portray one.

Becky has to play the role of a woman jealous of the attention her sister receives.

"I also don't get along with my mother, because she's trying to tell me things I don't believe," Becky explained. "She thinks Louise can do more than I think she can."

The actors in "Haiku" talk of empty schoolyards and silent summer rains and icy branches and a dead father laughing.

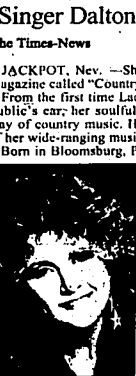
"You were born in early winter," Nell tells Louise. "John and I planned it that way. I can't imagine having a baby in the summer-time."

Louise doesn't notice.

Neither of these one-act plays utilizes elaborate sets or costumes. In fact, much of the set design is being beamed on stage courtesy of the Roper Auditorium's state-of-the-art lighting system.

The monologues in between the plays will be performed by drama students Oscar Melendez and Dale Laughlin.

Summer of movie love

Action thrillers dominate the blockbusters for this season

One way or another, the biggest story of the imminent summer movie season—and of the year, perhaps of the decade, maybe since Moses lost his sandals—will be the fate of Universal's "Waterworld." At a production cost now estimated at between \$170 million and \$200 million, the futuristic adventure will have to sell more tickets than "Forrest Gump" or "The Lion King" fast to break even.

Given its troubled production history, the three straight flops of its descending star, Kevin Costner, and its competition in a summer well stocked with action films, the chances of "Waterworld" becoming one of the three or four biggest hits in history are roughly the same as those of Madonna recouping her modest success.

If, on the other hand, it turns out to be a Universal executives please jump to the next paragraph... a complete bomb, its title will go down alphabetically behind "Cleopatra" and "Heaven's Gate" on an exclusive list of films that have brought ruin or humiliation to their studios. "Waterworld" can't break the bank at Universal's way ("Cleopatra" and "Heaven's Gate") at Fox and United Artists, but jokes about the new Waterworld Cocktail (Seagrams "n' cyclades) will have them down in the dumps for a while.

However things go for "Waterworld," moviegoers preparing to spend upward of \$2 billion on admission tickets this summer will have plenty to choose from in a lineup that is striking for its variety and balance.

From the surest bets down, here's an even dozen of likely winners:

1. "BATMAN FOREVER": The third and reportedly most whimsical episode in the "Batman" series gets a new Bruce Wayne (Val Kilmer in for Michael Keaton), with a side order of Robin (Chris O'Donnell), and two new villains (superhero Jim Carrey as the Riddler, and Tommy Lee Jones as the Joker).

2. "PAC MAN/ANTS": All they'd have to do is open the doors and say "A new Disney animated musical!" and stand back. Instead, they're opening the film with a colossal freebie for \$1000 or so in New York's Central Park and threatening to make everyone forget "The Lion King" by the fourth of July.

3. "DIE HARD: WITH A VENGEANCE": They could have

picked a better time for a story about blowing up buildings in an American city, but that's what "Die Hard" movies do, and their millions of fans—many of whom would miss a militia meeting to catch the opening—aren't likely to connect it to anything in real life.

4. "CRIMSON TIDE": The perfect popcorn movie (which gave the season an early launch Friday) stars Denzel Washington and Gene Hackman as feuding commanding officers aboard a U.S. submarine about to launch the first nuclear strike of World War Apocalypse. "Crimson Tide," as one studio executive said, "is this summer's Harrison Ford movie."

5. "CASPER": If quality control at Steven Spielberg's Amblin Entertainment could make kids believe in dinosaurs, imagine what they can do with Casper, Harvey Comics' friendly ghost. Universal's "The Flintstones" did most of the family business until "The Lion King" came along last summer, and "Casper," which opens May 26, will have a clear track for a month before "Fievel Goes West."

6. "APOLLO 13": Ron Howard has the world's top box-office star in Tom Hanks, and one of American history's greatest pioneer adventures to tell. Sounds like a sure thing until you recall the mess he made of a similar parlay—Tom Cruise and the Oklahoma Land Rush—in "Far and Away."

7. "WATERWORLD": Imagine what you could buy with \$200 million. A 747, Michael Ovitz's friendship, Demi Moore for 200 nights, in turning over the store to a dubious marquee name, an unproven director and a production schedule that called for weeks on a man-made island in the middle of the Pacific. Universal bought this year's biggest headache.

8. "FIRST KNIGHT": "Ghost" director Jerry Zucker returns to romance with another look at the Arthurian legend, with the silver fox Sean Connery as King Arthur, hot newcomer Julia Ormond as Guinevere, and Richard Gere, for some reason, as Sir Lancelot.

9. "THE BRIDGES OF MADISON COUNTY": Romance is back, and if sales of Robert James Waller's overripe novel about an Iowa farm wife's life-changing affair with a National Geographic photographer are any indication, Clint Eastwood's adaptation (starring himself and Meryl Streep) could be the sleeper weepie of the year.

10. "UNDER SIEGE 2": This is a

\$60 million sequel starring Steven Seagal, whom some people like. The pucker factor must be very high at Warner Bros., after giving Seagal an estimated \$60 million to direct and star in a sequel to a movie whose success was due almost entirely to director Andy Davis and Seagal's co-stars, Tommy Lee Jones and Gary Busey.

11. "CONGO": From the trailer showing scientists venturing into an uncharted African jungle inhabited by what appear to be angry N.E.L. line men in gorilla suits, maybe it should have been called "King Congo." Anyway, you can't go far wrong adapting a novel by Michael Crichton ("Jurassic Park").

12. "FORGET PARIS": Billy Crystal, NBA basketball and a Parisian romance may prove an unbeatable combination at the end of the playoffs.

That the list is a little top-heavy in action films comes as no surprise. Hollywood has been doing its summer banking with science fiction, fantasy, adventure and thrillers for decades. The surprise here is in the mix. There are three period action films (the romantic adventures "First Knight" and "Braveheart," Mel Gibson's 13th-century Scottish costume drama, and Walter Hill's western "Wild Bill"), one thriller about a submarine ("Crimson Tide") and another on a train ("Under Siege 2"), three horror films ("Lord of Illusions," "Hellraiser IV" and "Species"), and just one that is being sold with explosions ("Die Hard: With a Vengeance").

Some of the most promising action films are for kids. "The Mighty Morphin Power Rangers," based on the popular TV series, could become as hot as "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" and "Mortal Kombat" brings to the screen the Video Age's most successful genre.

As for the range and variety of love stories, there is one about a high school student who falls in love with a manic-depressive ("Mad Love"), one about the love between two teen-agers ("The Absolutely True Adventures of Two Girls in Love"), and one about guys ("Jellicoe").

And in the new tradition of uplifting summer transference fare (following in the heel prints of last year's "The Adventures of Priscilla" comes "Wings": The Movie, in which RuPaul and Deee-Lite take us inside the annual transvestite festival in New York's East Village.

Something for everybody.

New 'Jungle Book' animated, but not cartoon

New movies in Twin Falls video stores this week:

"Rudyard Kipling's The Jungle Book" (G) — Who can say why our friends at Disney decided to make a second version of "The Jungle Book?"

Lack of imagination? Perfectionism? Masochism perhaps? It does, after all, seem at least a little bit scholastic for the studio to put out a movie that invites close comparison to one of its own classics — in this case the animated version of the Rudyard Kipling tales. That delightfully unpretentious movie, which opened in October 1967, less than a year after Walt Disney's death, was the master's last animated feature.

The new attempt — a live-action adaptation — is unlikely to supplant the cartoon version in anyone's affections. A routine action drama, "Rudyard Kipling's The Jungle Book" contains qualities of both forgettability and painlessness — the bare necessities (as Baloo the bear of the cartoon version might have put it) in children's entertainment.

Like the cartoon version — and, for that matter, like the 1942 live-action version from United Artists — the new film tells the story of Mowgli, who was raised by wild animals in the jungles of India. You might call this a kiddie version of the Tarzan movies, except that Tarzan was for kids too.

Actually, this new "Jungle Book" may be somewhat too tame for younger children, but older kids will probably like it well enough.

Shot on location in India, the movie offers a fair amount of jungle footage — monkeys, elephants, bears, panthers, tigers, etc. There's also quite a bit of fighting and killing, although God does, once again, manage to triumph over Evil.

Directed and co-written by Stephen Sommers ("The Adventures of Huck Finn"), the

movie focuses on a romance between the "savagely" Mowgli (Jason Scott Lee) in a wide-eyed performance) and the cultivated Kitty (Lena Headey), daughter of the British military official (Sam Neill) in that part of India.

The villain of the piece is an officer (Cary Elwes) who wants to marry Kitty and who views the muscular Mowgli as an obstacle. Providing comic relief is the camp physician (John Cleese), who tutors Mowgli in the ways of man.

"No," says the good doctor, who is quizzing Mowgli on the people and objects in a series of photographs. "That's not a boat, that's the Queen Victoria." (*Orlando Sentinels*) (Video West, Hastings, Blockbuster)

"E.W. 2" (R) — A media satire whose theatrical release was originally delayed because its content is so similar to Oliver Stone's "Born on the Bay of Pigs." "E.W. 2" could be just as easily gone straight to video.

Stone's disjointed crime epic looks like a coherent work of art compared to this mindless debacle about a cocky suburban kid (Stephen Dorff) who becomes a national celebrity when he's held hostage by terrorists in a convenience store.

Video tapes of the 36-day siege are played on prime-time network news shows, at the request of the terrorists, who eventually run out of food, beer and patience. In the meantime, Dorff's non-stop defiance (expressed in the movie's title) has turned him into the nation's favorite rebel without a cause.

It also makes him a first-class bore. (*Seattle Times*) (Hastings, Blockbuster, Video West)

"Speechless" (PG-13) — James Carville and Mary Malincoln could be just as easily taken down by a pachyderm, but it isn't always easy. And that's basically the

premise of "Speechless," a bubbly romantic comedy starring Michael Keaton and Geena Davis as ideological opposites who attract on the campaign trail.

Written before the last presidential race, the movie is not modeled on the courtship of Carville and Malincoln; in fact, Robert King penned this caper before the real-life bipartisan couple made headlines. Instead, the film seems to have been inspired by such screwball pen pals as Tracy and Hepburn in "Woman of the Year."

Davis, who produced the movie with husband Renny Harlin, plays Julia, a speechwriter, for a Democratic candidate in the New Mexico senatorial contest. An insomniac, Julia unknowingly meets her Republican counterpart Kevin (Keaton) over the last box of Nyquil in an all-night convenience store. The encounter leads to a moonlit ride through the land of enchantment and to a reluctant parting the next morning.

Kevin tells Julia only that he writes the popular sitcom "Chuck & Eddie." He does — most of the time. Alas, Kevin steals one of Julia's campaign strategies, and she ends up in a wily war of words.

Snappy patter along with the likeable star couple's sure delivery are the movie's chief assets. (*Knight-Ridder Newspapers*) (Blockbuster, Video West, Hastings)

"Pontiac Moon" (PG-13) — The moment we first see and hear Ted Danson in "Pontiac Moon," in a classroom full of slack-jawed children listening to his overheated lecture about sperm, it is clear that some horrible decisions have been made. Not only is Danson badly miscast as a nerdy science teacher, but he has chosen to play him like some drunk spouting "Hamlet" in a neighborhood bar.

There is over the top, and there is over the moon, and apropos the subject of this peculiar road movie, about a father and son trying to

minimize the imminent 1969 Apollo 11 moon landing. Danson goes all the way.

And he is not the only one. Mary Steenburgen, as an agoraphobic who braves the outdoors to follow her husband and son across country, plays her part in a full-blown Lucy Ricardo panic attack. Flailing around on the screen like a raw nerve trying to stuff itself back in its sheath. It's the kind of performance that tests the resolve of reformed smokers.

Directed by Peter Medak, with a composer's wand, I imagine, "Pontiac Moon" is all about personal epiphanies and scientific miracles, which are one and the same to Danson's Washington Bellam, a lame Korean War veteran whose passion for life has been stifled by the same tragedy that drove his wife indoors seven years earlier.

Fearing that his 11-year-old son Andy (Ryan Todd) is taking root in his mother's isolation, Washington comes up with a scheme for the boy and himself to share "one perfect act." They will hike into Washington's classic 1949 Pontiac Chief convertible, and drive a circuitous 1,776-mile (symbolism alert!) route from their home in California, planning to arrive at a landmark desert crater at the precise moment the Apollo 11 crew reaches its destination, and with the Pontiac's odometer reading exactly 238,857 — the distance in miles between the Earth and the moon.

Along the way, as the landscape becomes increasingly similar to the gray, pocked surface of the moon, they encounter rednecks, a yahoo sheriff, a predatory, Blue Westem-style waitress (Cathy Moriarty), a gentle American Indian Vietnam vet (Eric Schweig), a band of an imaginary 1960s desert.

It's a very fanciful, and perfectly absurd, (*Knight-Ridder Newspapers*) (Hastings, Video West, Blockbuster)

Kevin Kline tops role with French dressing

NEW YORK (AP) — Playing a Frenchman had a lasting effect on Kevin Kline.

Before he'll field any questions nowadays, he needs a jolt of high-octane java. Not that wimpy American brew either, mon frere.

The man needs espresso. Make it strong.

"I got addicted in France," he says, stirring in four sugars when it's finally delivered.

Kline, dapper in an Irish tweed jacket and sage tie, is perhaps America's finest classic actor. He's also a silly guy.

Sipping eagerly, yet gingerly because of the steam, he gets a foggy milk mustache on his upper lip; then starts talking as if he hasn't noticed.

In his latest film, "French Kiss," Kline plays a romantic comedy he made with Meg Ryan, the acting challenge was to be convincing as a French lout.

"We did everything we could to make me look French," he says. "I couldn't shave. On the set it was always, 'Grease, more grease in the hair. Hey, did you notice again this month?'"

But seriously folks, the Shakespearean trouper and two-time Tony winner who won an Academy Award for "A Fish Called Wanda," didn't take the job

lightly. Intensive language study was required. Several scenes feature Kline speaking French over subtitles.

"I had always wanted to become fluent, but the only way to really do that is to spend time in the country," he says. "So I thought, 'Well, not only spending time in France, but also playing a Frenchman, would be a good crash course.' It dovetailed nicely."

There also was the, er, challenge of being convincing as a glib French lover boy plagued by a spell of impotency.

"Oh, that took a lot of research, too," he says, keeping a straight face. "I did the whole movie blithely confident all the impotence jokes would be taken out. Boy was I surprised when I went to a screening and they got the biggest laughs."

After draining his cup with a greedy slurp, Kline soon starts fidgeting, adopting awkward, uncomfortable poses in his armchair as the caffeine kicks in. Asked whether landing the lead opposite Ryan was particularly satisfying because he's 47, Kline laughs out loud, unable to quit for a painfully long stretch of time.

When he finally gets a hold of himself, he's suddenly all business, saying it's no major casting coup

because "French Kiss" isn't a dramatic love story.

"Gary Grant was doing romantic comedies well into his 50s," he says. "It really knows no age, that particular comic device, of the couple who is at odds with each other, who fight their attraction for one another, who deny it right up until the end."

Kline is taking a little time for interviews before flying off to London to begin shooting the sequel to "A Fish Called Wanda."

The bottom line is that he's in his prime, happily married to actress Phoebe Cates and the father of two

children. He's not worried about critical reviews or box-office numbers.

"I have nothing riding on any movie anymore," he says, which launches him on the topic of U.S.-French cultural differences.

"It's a very American notion the idea that a movie is no good if it doesn't make \$100 million, that you're not a movie star unless your movie makes at least \$100 million," he said. "And these journalists who say, 'Is this the one that's going to get you that top echelon of superguru megastardom?'"

Gosh, I don't know."

'Forget Paris': Bad film has correct name

"Forget Paris" is a romantic comedy. That is advertised in the opening credits with the playing of a chestnut ballad sung by a pop icon, a ritual followed by the "Sleepless in Seattle" wannabes. This time, the song is "Our Love Is Here to Stay" by the sublime Billie Holiday.

The Gershwin tune is later reprised by Gene Kelly, and the soundtrack includes 13 other Tin Pan Alley standards. But for all the romantic accoutrements, including a courtship amid the wonders of Paris, the most memorable scenes of "Forget Paris" take place on the basketball floor.

Billy Crystal, who serves as the producer, director, co-writer and co-star, is obviously a basketball freak. He cast himself as an NBA referee, which allows him to hire the biggest names in the sport.

And what a referee. He waves off a game-winning shot by Charles Barkley at the final buzzer. No more

time! he announces to the furious Sir Charles. Crystal even ejects Kareem Abdul-Jabbar — on Jabbar's farewell tour. Derailed by his rocky romance, he ejects other stars who question his judgment.

As with all romantic comedies, the stars — Crystal and Debra Winger — "meet cute." Crystal flies to France with the casket of his father, who had wanted to be buried among his World War II army buddies. The airline loses the casket. After many bureaucratic hassles, Crystal meets a sympathetic nurse named Winger.

They fall in love (although she is married to an unseen Frenchman). They even dance on the Seine, just like Gene Kelly and Leslie Caron in "An American in Paris."

Winger ranges to shed her French husband and join Crystal in America. But marriage to an NBA referee is far from idyllic, and the pair suffer periods of misunder-

standing and separation.

All this is recounted in flashbacks as the couple's friends sit at a restaurant table. It is a clumsy device as the voices and points of view change confusingly.

Romantic comedy must have two factors: a feathery touch and chemistry between the two lovers. "Forget Paris" has neither. Crystal's comedy is angst-driven and fails to evoke a romantic mood. And the "Crystal-

Winger combo is no trip to the moon on gossamer wings.

Crystal wrote the script with his usual collaborators, Lowell Ganz and Babaloo Mandel ("City Slickers," "Mr. Saturday Night"). A few of the scenes are hilarious, especially when a pigeon gets stuck in Winger's hair. But too many of the throwaway lines should have been just that ("Switzerland? They're vicious. They punched holes in my cheese").

Summer truly begins with 3rd 'Die Hard'

Movies playing in the Magic Valley this weekend. Reviews are by the Los Angeles Times and ratings are by the Motion Picture Association of America.

BOYS — An action comedy about two mismatched Miami cops who trade identities to keep a witness happy as is loud, violent and preposterous as it sounds. While audiences will gain an increased appreciation for the comic talents of Martin Lawrence and Will Smith, they will also wonder why Hollywood can't create anything better for them. (R, intense violent action, pervasive strong language.)

CRIMSON TIDE — A story of seething conflicts aboard an American submarine on the eve of Armageddon that is as crisp as the creases on the Naval uniforms of stars Denzel Washington and Gene Hackman. Though the plot is strictly by the numbers, director Tony Scott, screenwriter Michael Schiffer and a convincing physical look combine to add an enviable level of polish to those old familiar moves. (R, strong language.)

DIE HARD WITH A VENGEANCE — Original director in the "Die Hard" trilogy John McTiernan returns with Bruce Willis. This time, Samuel L. Jackson is Willis' reluctant partner, and Jeremy Irons plays Simon, a brilliant, vengeful terrorist keen on blowing the smithereens out of New York. (R.)

DON JUAN DEMARCO — Marlon Brando plays a psychiatrist who enters into the fantasy of a patient, played by Johnny Depp, who thinks he's Don Juan. Both actors are fun to watch but the film is like a cure "Eques" — it romanticizes the boy's delusions by making normalcy seem mundane. Faye Dunaway costs. (PG-13 for sexual content.)

THE ENGLISHMAN WHO WENT UP A HILL AND CAME DOWN A MOUNTAIN — That ungainly title is the only thing that isn't refreshingly light about this deft romantic comedy, set in Wales in 1917 and reminiscent of the golden age of British comedy. Hugh Grant proves he has no peer in this kind of thing, as a cartographer is caught in a village battle about the height of a mountain — who finds local beauty Tara Fitzgerald awfully distracting. (PG, mild language.)

FRENCH KISS — Kevin Kline's sly parody of a sly Frenchman is the best reason to see this pleasantly inane Lawrence Kasdan-Adam Brooks romantic comedy co-starring the overbearingly cute Meg Ryan. The film is crammed with so many anti-Gallic jokes that it may set back U.S.-French trade relations. (PG-13, some sexuality, language and drug references.)

A GOOFY MOVIE — Disney animated feature starring Goofy and his son Max as they attempt to bond on a camping trip. Tiny tots proba-

bly won't mind it too much; adults may approve of the little civility lessons tucked into the tomfoolery. (G.)

RORY — This is a sweet little movie about the adventures of a young pig so adorable he threatens to turn us all into vegetarians. It's contrived but ideal for youngsters and romantic lovers of all ages. With Michael Roacher, Doug Stone, Kristy Young and James Donadio. (Times guidelines: This is a family film, suitable for all.)

A LITTLE PRINCESS — A magical version of the Frances Hodgson Burnett novel of a little girl separated from her father in a nasty boarding school during World War I. Well acted, beautifully visualized. Directed by Alfonso Cuarón. (G.)

OUTBREAK — Dustin Hoffman is a crusading physician trying to save the world from a killer plague in this preposterous but slam-bang action thriller that is really a B-movie with A credits. Morgan Freeman and Rene Russo co-star. (R, language.)

ROB ROY — A moderately involving tale of an 18th century Scottish Robin Hood whose unbending sense of honor gets him in all kinds of violent trouble. While Liam Neeson in the title role and Jessica Lange as his fiery wife are unobjectionable, the acting honors go to Tim

Roth, spectacular as the villainous Archie Cunningham. (R, violence and sexuality.)

TOMMY BOY — This zowdy, ramblous comedy turns loose on the big screen SNL's hefty dynamo Chris Farley, and David Spade as his diminutive sidekick. Farley plays a boisterous rich guy who must now save the family business, with the help of the understandably dubious Spade. (PG-13, for sex-related

humor, some drug content and nudity.)

WHILE YOU WERE SLEEPING — Sandra Bullock is charming in this slickly engineered, too-sweet slice of amiable woman who mistakenly ends up fiancée to a comatose man (Peter Gallagher) while being subtly romanced by his brother (Bill Pullman). The black comic possibilities in the material are sugared. (PG, for language.)

Eddie Van Halen raises hair with haircut

During the past year, Van Halen released a new album.

Edward Van Halen got sober. And the guitar whiz cut his hair.

Guess which story made the biggest impact? "People really freaked out about the hair," says Van Halen, who in an alcohol-fueled rage took a razor to his distinctive long locks.

"I'm like, 'What's the big deal, people? It's only hair!'" I guess.

I've been known for my hair more than I care for. Hospitality they like, my music, not my hair.

That's still a safe assumption. With sales of more than two million copies of "Balance," the group's 11th straight multimillion seller — Van Halen is still a hit prospect, even in the wake of the guitars' arrest April 11 in Burbank, Calif., for possessing a concealed handgun.

The group remains hard rock's reigning favorite, holding its own amidst grunge and all the other forms of so-called alternative rock. It's what industry folks refer to as a "headbanger."

And Edward Van Halen is still the hero of choice amid the air-guitar set, hugely influenced by his deft licks and trademark technique of tapping the strings on the guitar neck.

"He's one of those guys I'll always look up to forever because he's such an icon," says Guns N' Roses guitarist Slash. "He changed the face of guitar. Whatever he does is cool."

Ironically, Van Halen tinkered with his approach during "Balance." It's less frenetic and moodier. He's tapping less and experimenting more with big sweeps of sound.

"I think it's a very, very guitar-oriented record," says the Holland-born Van Halen, 40, who grew up in Pasadena and lives in California's San Fernando Valley with his wife, 14 years, actress Valerie Bertinelli, and their 4-year-old son, Wolfgang. "I'm just not blowing as fast as I can all the time. I think I did a lot more layering, more subtle things."

"I don't know that there was a lot of thought behind that. I've always just written my own way. I'd say we reflect on what's going on, try to capture the moment." "Balance" is a four-month slice of our lives, a lot of people have mentioned this album has a darker tone to it. Well, it's not

all party, party, party like it was in the '70s and '80s."

In fact, "Balance" reflects one of the toughest periods during Van Halen's 17 years — perhaps even more trying than when original singer David Lee Roth left in 1984 to be replaced by Sammy Hagar.

In 1993, manager Ed Leffer — who'd been with Van Halen since 1985 and with Hagar even longer — died of cancer. That threw the group into a directionless turmoil. At home, the guitarist fielded phone calls. Leffer would normally intercede with such unwanted invitations to host "Star Search" and for the band — including brother Alex Van Halen on drums and Michael Anthony on bass — to perform at Woodstock '94.

Complicating matters was the search for a new manager, which took some time for the four band members to agree on. Eventually they hired Ray Daniels, who also manages the group Rush and is related to Alex Van Halen by marriage.

"I was ready to pull the hair out of my head,

literally," says Edward Van Halen. "Instead of pulling it out, I shaved it."

The shaving episode — which came in the middle of a conversation with Aerosmith manager Tim Collins — was one of the things that slapped Van Halen into sobriety. "I felt like I was watching everything go out the window," says Van Halen, whose father — also a musician — introduced him to drinking when he was an adolescent. "It was a rude awakening. At that point was probably when I was drinking the most; I wanted to lose myself in it, to disappear."

"Then I woke up from it, and it was like a slap in the face, a wake-up call. 'Hey, buddy, you better change your life.' It's like in cartoons, when you see the light bulb pop up over someone's head. All of a sudden... I realized I can do it without the booze."

Van Halen acknowledges that Bertinelli has come close to leaving him over his drinking. On "Balance," his habit is immortalized in the brief, dissonant instrumental "Strung Out." It was recorded during the couple's stay at Marvin Hamlisch's Malibu beach house, when Van Halen spent six hours "disassembling" a white grand piano by plucking and scraping the strings with everything from forks and knives to batteries.

Van Halen maintains his drinking was never recreational but to help him overcome his creative insecurities. "When you're had time off," he says, "I could be sober for four or five months. As soon as I walked into the studio, I would start again. I truly believe that music comes from somewhere else, and I'm like a channel or whatever. And I was so afraid of losing that if I stopped drinking."

Now, however, he's found that "things come easier. I guess I'm much more open for things to come to me. I can get into a state of mind, really focus and play guitar."

"Music is the only thing we know," says the guitarist, who's also become an avid golfer. "My father was a musician. We grew up that way. Alex and I played on the boat when I was 8 years old and we were coming over here."

"So music was instilled in us early on. We never realized how big or successful this would be; that wasn't the point. And we're making music now for the same reasons, to have fun and try to do something good."

Button B on Genesis) and Cast A Spell (Hutton X on SNES; on Genesis, hit the start button while holding down the D-Button). Along your journey, you will collect Levitation Crystals, Fire Pots, Smart Bombs, and more.

Good points, bad points: Graphics are better on SNES than Genesis, but a weak soundtrack loses its scariness way into the game. Despite its industry rating of 6 and over, the game is too scary for young children. It's better for players 10 and up. For seasoned

players, this game looks like "Bram Stoker's Dracula." As such, it delivers a decent game that's not too bloody and quite challenging for young people.

Tip: Your character can only shoot when he's not moving. The downside is that there is a time lapse between shots, which could cost your player his life, so shoot quickly and don't get too close to the evil demons.

Disney pulls out stops for 'Pocahontas' hype

The Walt Disney Co. continues to bring back the excitement of old-time show releases with its latest animated feature, "Pocahontas."

As old-timers will recall, in the olden days, movies first opened in a few first-run downtown theaters before making their way to the suburbs. The movie-going experience was enhanced by a trip to the city or by the anticipatory wait for a hot movie to make it to the local Bijou.

While not breaking with the pervasive practice of releasing a big movie to 1,500-2,000 theaters at once, Disney has added glamour to its already busy heavy animated films with exclusive releases in New York and Los Angeles, complete with a live stage show, a week before general release.

With "Pocahontas" the studio has

added elaborations — The movie's wide release is scheduled for June 23. But on June 16, one theater each in Chicago, Houston, Detroit, Atlanta and St. Louis will feature the Indian-settler romance-adventure with the stage show. New York will have a gala open-air showing of "Pocahontas" on June 10 with the biggest stage show of all.

"At its flagship El Capitan Theatre in Hollywood, Disney also will open "Pocahontas" and its stage show June 16. But whereas the stage shows end in other cities by June 22, the El Capitan's live presentation will continue through Aug. 20.

Now obviously, all this gets "Pocahontas" a great deal of publicity. But because the animated films have delivered on their hype consistently, the excitement isn't merely manufactured.

As most fans of the series know, George Lucas has begun planning for the continuation of the "Star Wars"

saga with the next trilogy (which predates the action in the first) in development.

Work also is going ahead on the old series. Set for release in 1997, the 20th anniversary of "Star Wars," the original trilogy is undergoing a re-cut.

Some are about what you'd expect. The soundtrack, long a preoccupation of Lucas, whose company designed the THX Sound System, is being digitally remastered. The film also will include previously unreleased footage.

New developments in computer graphics, in which Lucas' Industrial Light & Magic has been a pioneer, will allow even more additions. Battle and crowd scenes will feature creatures and space vehicles that will be added with the new technology. Reportedly, a scene between Han Solo and Jabba the Hutt will be completed and added to the movie.

Gooding boys seek 3rd district track title

GOODING — When a group of coaches decided several years ago to build Gooding’s track program from the ground up, they could not have known they were putting together a local dynasty.

But the Senators are trying to lay claim to that title by winning their third straight Class A-3 District 4 track championship, and they got off to a good start Thursday. The Gooding boys racked up wins in the long jump, high jump, pole vault, 3,200-meter run and medley relay, while the girls used Holly Bradshaw’s 1.4-second victory in the 3,200-meter run for the early lead in the two-day event at the Idaho School for the Deaf and Blind.

While area bragging rights are at stake, the more important goal is a trip to the state track meet in Boise next week. With that in mind, the Magic Valley’s smallest schools — Class A-3 and Class A-4 — completed several field events, the 3,200-meter run and medley relay. Thursday, with finals in the remaining running events beginning at 3 p.m. today.

“It’s the track,” Gooding coach Jeff Jeffries said, gesturing to the ISDB track — one of the nicer facilities in the Magic Valley. “It gets kids excited about participating in the program.”

The track may be part of it, but the groundwork was laid eight years ago when Jeffries and others started promoting track and field among the younger students in the district.

“You start with the grade schools,” Jeffries said. “You don’t build a track program in high school.”

He pointed to four- or five-star Lyle Rogers as evidence.

“Lyle was in fourth grade when we started this,” Jeffries said.

Rogers and teammate Steve Elgan led Gooding’s first start on Thursday. Rogers’ time of 10:27.8 was tops in the 3,200-meter run.

Elgan shook off a sub-par performance in the long jump to set a new school

record in the pole vault — 13 feet, 7 inches — and a personal best in the high jump at 6 feet, 6 inches.

And as for as translating local success into state titles goes, strategy plays as big a part in track and field as in any other sport.

“We’ve got spies all over the state” that send in newspaper clippings and keep an eye on top performers from other areas, Jeffries said. Those reports led him to move Rogers out of the open 800-meter

run and into an anchor position on the Senators’ medley relay team.

With as many as 10 boys who can run the 800 in two minutes, Rogers’ chances of winning a state medal — and adding

Highland error opens door for Bruins

TWIN FALLS — An attempt to rub salt into the wounds of an obviously vanquished Twin Falls nine backfired on Highland Thursday evening, paving the way for a most unlikely Bruin comeback.

The end result, a 10-7 Twin Falls triumph, kept the Bruins in the chase for a Class A-1 state high school baseball tournament invitation at home against Burley this afternoon. The survivor advances to a one-game playoff against the Idaho Falls area runner-up on Saturday for the right to join Region III champ Minico at state.

Ram pitcher Clint Fullmer, who came on to stifle a Twin Falls outburst in the first inning, carried a 9-6 advantage into the bottom of the seventh and appeared destined to become the winner of record after Twin Falls’ seventh and eighth batters went down on ground balls. It certainly appeared so when Jeff Hanchey popped up to short two pitches later.

But the Rams’ celebration came to an abrupt halt as the ball popped out of the glove at the end of an intended one-handed, close to the body, basket catch.

That, combined with the arrival of the top of the Bruin lineup, coincided with a bad case of nerves on Fullmer’s part.

The hard-throwing right-hander issued back-to-back walks to Chris Traveller and Jon Axman, setting the stage for a Greg

Scheelhaas triple that knotted the contest and left the winning run at the keystone corner.

At that point, Highland coach Zane Simmons opted to pass Bruin cleanup hitter Chad Merritt and ever-dangerous Willie Bird to get at reserve catcher Andy Pyle. That move worked an inning earlier when the Twin Falls youngster gathered to short for the third out, with the bases purposely loaded.

As insurance, Simmons replaced Fullmer with first baseman Greg Schumacher. That ploy misfired when Schumacher was wide of the plate on a 3-1 count.

“It looked good from here. It was a pretty tough pitch for Andy to take,” Creek admitted. “It’s hard to come back

Jordan’s season ends with Magic

CHICAGO — The first time, Michael Jordan ended an era himself. This time, the Orlando Magic ended it for him.

Shaquille O’Neal and Arfennee Hardaway, two young players who emerged as marquee names during Jordan’s 21-month retirement, led Orlando to a 108-102 victory Thursday night that eliminated the Chicago Bulls from the playoffs.

Nick Anderson, a Chicago kid who grew up idolizing Jordan, got the best of his hero down the stretch as the Magic scored the final 14 points after trailing 102-94 with less than three minutes to play.

“Call it a passing the mantle if you will,” Orlando general manager Pat Williams said. “It’s a hard thing to grasp that we’re only halfway there. Because this was Michael and Shaq, because it had big TV ratings, it

didn’t seem like just a (conference) semifinal.”

O’Neal had 27 points and Hardaway 21 for Orlando, which will meet the winner of the Indiana-New York series in the Eastern Conference finals.

It was the earliest postseason exit since 1988 for Jordan, who carried the Bulls to NBA titles in 1991, 1992 and 1993 before leaving in his prime and only to return exactly two months ago with his simple and dramatic “I’m back.”

The Bulls were immediately considered favorites for another championship, partly because of Jordan’s ability to dominate in the clutch.

But for the third time this series, the NBA’s career leader in playoff scoring average faded down the stretch and the Magic gladly accepted Chicago’s generosity to “claim the biggest victory since joining the

Sam Cassell also hit two 3-pointers and Robert Horry got one.

Only four teams in NBA history have recovered to win a playoff series after trailing

3-1. Boston did it in 1968 and 1981, both times against Philadelphia, the Los Angeles Lakers overcame Phoenix in 1970 and Washington in 1979 against San Antonio.

Charles Barkley, with sub-performances in Games 3 and 5, hit his first 10 shots and finished the half with 27 points as the Suns led 58-55. But Barkley took only two shots in the fourth quarter and finished with 34 points.

Wesley Persons added 15 points for Phoenix. Clyde Drexler, still recovering from the flu, scored 20 for the Rockets.

Preakness may end jockey's streak Penguins nip Capitals, 3-0 CSI heptathlete finishes 13th at nationals

BALTIMORE (AP) — If jockey Jerry Bailey is right, trainer D. Wayne Lukas' three-race winning streak in Triple Crown competition will end Saturday in the Preakness.

Bailey finished second in the Kentucky Derby on Tejuano Run, sandwiched between the duo of winner Thunder Gulch and Timber Country.

"When Jerry got off the horse he said he was one race away," Ken McPeak, Tejuano Run's trainer, said Thursday.

McPeak believes Tejuano Run is the best physically he's been all year and ready to win. He also believes "Thunder Gulch and Timber Country are the horses to beat, without a doubt."

"They give me a good 1-2 punch," said Lukas, who would become only the second trainer to win four straight Triple Crown races. Thunder Gulch's Derby win followed Tabasco Cat's victories in the 1994 Preakness and Belmont Stakes. Lucien Laurin won the 1972 Belmont with River Wishes and the 1973 Triple Crown with Secretariat.

Thunder Gulch was made the 2-1 early favorite in the field of 11 3-year-olds entered in the 1 1/4-mile Preakness at Pimlico.

The front-running Talkin Man, who faded to 12th in the Derby, was listed at 4-1, followed by Timber Country, 9-2, and Tejuano Run, 6-1.

Talkin Man, ridden by Mike Smith, drew the post position 10 in the Preakness. Lukas, 5, Timber Country will start from No. 7 hole, and Thunder Gulch will leave No. 11.

"I'm not concerned, we handled it before out there," Lukas said. Timber Country finished third after starting from the No. 15 post in the Derby, while Thunder Gulch only won from the No. 16 post. While Thunder

Gulch had a perfect trip under Gary Stevens, Talkin Man and Tejuano Run both were an eighth-mile remaining after having weaved in and out of traffic under Pat Day.

"Pat spent most of the time steering him rather than riding him," Lukas said. "He was not nearly as aggressive as I wanted. I need Pat to put some zip into Timber Country. I need to give Pat a Vince Lombardi speech."

Timber Country, the 1994 champion 2-year-old, in his fourth starts this year.

Thunder Gulch and Timber Country will race as separate betting interest because of different owners. Because of common ownership, Timber Country was coupled in the betting with the filly Serena's Song in the Derby.

Serena's Song finished 16th and will race against fillies Friday in the Black-Eyed Susan.

"I keep asking Wayne when he's going to let me win," McPeak said.

Tejuano Run has finished in front of Thunder Gulch in the Blue Grass and ahead of Timber Country in the Derby, but did not win either race. He, of course, was second to Thunder Gulch in the Derby, and he finished third when Timber Country won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 5.

McPeak said Tejuano Run came out of the 1 1/4-mile Blue Grass at Keeneland, in which he finished fourth with a slight lung infection. The stretch, 10 days before the May 6 Derby, also running hot had the angles-of-his front feet changed because he had been hitting his hind legs with his front hooves.

"Hopefully, we're out of excuses," McPeak said. "He's over the lung infection." The colt, owned by the Judd family, Lasik in the Derby, but will run clean Saturday.

There was plenty of speed in the Derby,

and the Preakness won't lack for speed either, Lukas said. He said that Gary, Mystery Storm and Star Standard.

"I think we've got quality speed, classic speed," trainer Nick Zito said of Star Standard, whose last race was a front-running victory in the 1 1/4-mile Lexington on a sloppy track April 23 at Keeneland. "He will be winging. I don't care how much speed is in there, he'll be on the lead if he has to go the first quarter mile in 21 seconds."

The only other Derby starter in the Preakness field is Mecke, who finished fifth as a member of the six-horse mutual field.

Joining Star Standard in making their debuts in Triple Crown competition will be Oliver's Twist, Our Gatsby, Mystery Storm, Iron and Papa Brass.

Oliver's Twist will make a 40-minute ride to Pimlico from trainer-breeder J. William Boniface's Bonita Farm Saturday morning. The colt won the 1 1/4-mile Federico Tesio April 22 at Pimlico.

In 1983, Boniface named Deputed Testimony to Pimlico the morning of the race, and that will become the last non-Derby starter to win the Preakness.

The last Derby winner to win the Preakness was Sunday Silence in 1989.

Our Gatsby finished second in the 1-mile Derby-Trial April 29 at Churchill Downs. Downward Bound finished third in the Derby-Trial April 29 at Oaklawn Park, Texas. Brad Iron finished seventh in the 1-mile Cascaro April 22 at Retama Park, Texas. Brad Iron, a Kentucky-bred colt, will be making his first start Sunday at Pimlico where he won three of four starts this year.

Capitals, 3-0

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Goaltender Ken Wregget again came up big in a Game 7 in Pittsburgh, stopping all 33 Washington shots as the Penguins completed a comeback from a 3-1 deficit to oust the Capitals 3-0 Thursday night.

Washington, only one win away from eliminating Pittsburgh after consecutive 6-2 victories in Games 3 and 4, became only the 13th NHL team — and the third in Capitals' history — to blow a 3-1 series lead.

The Capitals also couldn't hold such leads against the eventual Stanley Cup champion Penguins in 1992, and the New York Islanders in a 1987 collapse finished off by a four-overtime Game 7.

Norm Maciver and Ron Francis scored first-period goals and the Penguins, who twice rallied from two-goal deficits at home earlier in the series, made just such a lead stand up behind Wregget.

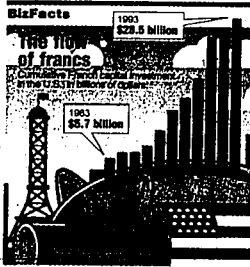

Demand spurs Micron to move up hiring pace

BOISE — Micron Technology Inc. is moving up its timetable to hire 1,200 people in Boise, and may add hundreds more by 1997 because demand for computer memory chips is exploding.

"The number looks like it's going to increase," spokesman Kipp Bedard said. He declined to be more specific.

The worldwide market for Micron's main product — dynamic random access memory, or DRAM, chips — is expected to grow 78 percent between 1995 and 1998, to about \$91 billion, according to the Semiconductor Industry Association.

Micron is the eighth-biggest DRAM producer in the world, with 5.8 percent of the market. It also is building a \$1.3 billion factory in Utah to keep up with demand.

Hecla, English company to re-open Alaska mine

LONDON — Hecla Mining Co. and the RTZ Corp. PLC intend to reopen a gold, silver, zinc and lead mine in Alaska that had been closed because of low metals prices.

RTZ said the Greens Creek mine on Admiralty Island near Juneau will be developed at a cost of about \$87 million over the next two years.

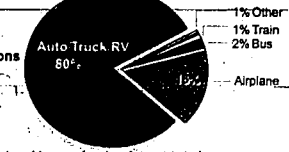

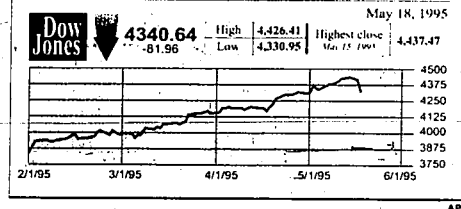

In a fundamental sense, there are some worries that the slowing U.S. economy will hurt corporate earnings in the second and third quarters, analysts said.

But they said Thursday's drop probably had more to do with worries that the Dow has gone straight up without a correction for too many months.

The market's tone was weak from the opening, with activity related to Friday's

May options expiration and soft Treasury bonds leading to early losses that accelerated as the day wore on.

As the Dow slipped, investors decided to take profits, sending the blue-chip index to its lowest point in a week and a half.

"I think what you had before was related to the closeout," said Donald Selkin, head of stock index futures at Prudential Securities in New York, referring to Friday's expiration. "The dynamics are really set beforehand. But it feeds on itself."

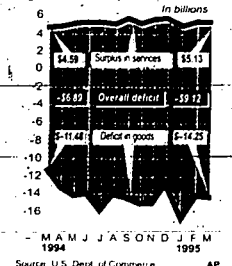

Trade deficit shrinks, not with Japan

The Associated Press

WASHINGTON — The U.S. trade deficit narrowed slightly but the gap with Japan soared and the imbalance with Mexico set an all-time high. Stock prices broke a string of record highs and plunged following the news Thursday.

The Clinton administration, already threatening huge sanctions against Japan, said the new figures only stiffened its resolve to break Japanese trade barriers.

The trade report Thursday from the Commerce Department showed that the overall deficit in goods and services narrowed 0.9 percent in March to a seasonally adjusted \$9.12 billion, compared to February's deficit of \$9.15 billion.

Investors, who had been looking for even more of an improvement, used the report as reason to dump stocks and take profits.

America's deficit with Japan shot up 30 percent to \$5.14 billion, down from the all-time high of \$5.7 billion set last October. Japan's shipments to the United States rose by 21 percent with one-fourth of that increase coming from Japanese autos and parts.

"I built that character and I wanted to play her again," she said in a recent telephone interview. "That was the lure that prompted me to return to the show. When I first played Cecily, I was basically brought in to break up Julie and Charles' romance. Cecily was a bit of a bitch, and it was fun to play her that way. Cecily left (the show) when she broke up with her husband, Nico. By that time she had gone through a divorce."

When Rosa began playing Cecily, she was worked with Robbie McNeil, who was then cast as Charlie. They had chemistry that made it easy to work together and sustain the brooding relationship that ensued. In December 1994, after five years away from "All My Children," Rosa returned as Cecily and Charlie was now being played by Christopher Lawford.

"It's different working with Chris. In a way it was more challenging than working with Robbie because I had to find a whole new dynamic. I admired, we knew each other's strengths and weaknesses and played to them. With Chris, we've had to discover each other's working habits. We didn't fall into any traps by being too comfortable with each other."

Rosa was born Rosa Langschwandt in Cuba of a Spanish mother and a German father. They moved to Queens, New York, where she grew up. When she was in the middle-of-her high school years, she finally came to Miami, Florida.

Rosa had studied dance but she admits that she was not very good and had no intentions of entering show business. However, she went with a girlfriend to a high school audition for the musical "The Fantasticks" and the director thought she looked right for the leading role. When she found out Rosa could carry a tune, she got the part. When she was pressured into selecting her college subjects, she gravitated towards theatre arts and earned a Bachelor's of Fine Arts Degree from the University of Miami.

Rosa worked mostly in music videos and commercials before the offer came from "All My Children." In the interim, she married director Gerald P. Nevin and they both relocated from Los Angeles to New York City.

Having lived for some years on both coasts, Rosa says she still feels like she is her kind of town. "I'm a bit hyper, and the pace of New York City suits my style."

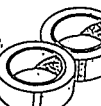

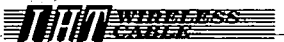

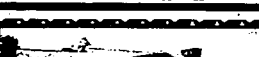
