





# Report: Nuke tests targeted soldiers' fears, minds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Troop exercises during nuclear bomb tests in the 1950s were designed to convince soldiers their fear of radiation was irrational and to give them "an emotional vaccination," newly declassified Pentagon records show.

It has been known for decades that soldiers were deliberately exposed to radiation during exercises starting in 1951 at the Nevada nuclear test range. The newly available documents open a window into the reasoning of military leaders in secret discussions about how far to go in using GIs in the tests.

The basic judgment, as reflected in the government records, was that soldiers had an exaggerated fear of nuclear radiation after Hiroshima. The solution was to put GIs in foxholes near ground zero of nuclear bomb blasts and then move them even closer after the shock wave passed.

Little consideration was given to long-term health risks to the soldiers. The focus was on the short term, to erase what one general in a 1951 report called a "combat unfavorable psychology."

In a newly declassified Pentagon briefing paper dated Feb. 27, 1953, the purpose of the indoctrination effort was described this way:

"To remove from the minds of the troops — and therefore to a degree from the minds of other persons in the services with whom they will later come in contact — the folklore and superstition regarding atomic explosions, ... particularly effects connected with nuclear radiation hazards."

Military leaders felt this psychological-manipulation was essential because of their belief that nuclear war with the Soviet Union could begin at any time. The Army was then envisioning a war in which nuclear weapons would be used on the battlefield.

The formerly secret Pentagon papers are among thousands of pages of documents of the now-defunct Armed Forces Special Weapons Project that have been declassified by

the National Archives at the request of The Associated Press. The Weapons Project coordinated the military's role in nuclear arms development.

Additional new documentation has been collected by the presidential Advisory Committee on Human Radiation Experiments.

Deaths and injuries caused by the two U.S. nuclear bombings of Japan in 1945 gave rise to worry among soldiers and the general public about the dangers of radiation.

"Fear of radiation is almost universal among the uninitiated, and unless it is overcome in the military forces it could present a most serious problem," Dr. Richard L. Melling, chairman of the Pentagon's Armed Forces Medical Policy Council, wrote in June 27, 1951, memo stamped "top secret."

Melling recommended putting combat troops 12 miles from ground zero and then moving them closer after the explosion. In fact some troops later were placed just 2,000 yards from ground zero, and many were only slightly farther away.

A June 3, 1952, memo suggested placing troops only 800 yards away.

Greg Herken, a nuclear historian with the presidential Advisory Committee on Human Radiation Experiments, said the U.S. nuclear troop exercises were modest compared with those of the Soviet Red Army in the 1950s.

"Both sides were playing that same game — to show that they could fight on a nuclear battlefield," Herken said in an interview.

At least 40,000 men from all branches of the U.S. military participated in eight "Desert Rock" exercises in Nevada, from 1951 to 1957, according to Pentagon figures.

Air Force Maj. Gen. Kenneth L. Hageman, director of the Defense Nuclear Agency, which is reviewing Cold War-era radiation research on human subjects, told a congressional committee on Jan. 25, 1994, that about 1,600 individuals in the "Desert Rock" tests received radiation doses in excess of 5 reentgens.

Some veterans now link serious ailments, including cancers, to their participation in the Nevada tests, and many have organized to win compensation. The extent of injuries or illnesses that can be blamed on "Desert Rock" is not clear; radiation exposure records are incomplete or missing.

The available records indicate precautions were taken to limit soldiers' radiation exposure, but this was mostly a calculated bid to show the men they would not suffer any immediate ill effects.

The military's thinking is perhaps

best reflected in a comment by Rear Adm. W.K. Mendenhall Jr., a senior nuclear-weapons official who in an Oct. 18, 1951, memo complained that the bomb test scientists were wasting time trying to calculate precise pause-time limits for human radiation exposure.

"The field commander is not interested in" the science of measuring radiation, Mendenhall wrote. "He merely wants to know, can the troops tolerate the radiation to which they are being subjected for five minutes, or five days."

There is no indication in the records that experiments were con-

ducted that deliberately sought to injure soldiers, though such possibilities were discussed. It is clear, too, that some tests did not go as planned.

One report said, eight officers whose film badges indicated they absorbed 14 reentgens of radiation in a 1953 bomb test actually received nearly twice that amount. At the time, exposures were supposed to be limited to 6 reentgens per test.

The Atomic Energy Commission, the civilian agency that oversaw

nuclear weapons development during this period, saw what its officials apparently considered unacceptable risks in putting soldiers as close as 7,000 yards from ground zero. Among three "possible hazards" the AEC noted in an April 2, 1952, memo: that the bomb blast might yield more radiation than expected; that it might be dropped closer to the troops than planned; and that the troops, "because of failure of discipline," might get too much radiation.

## More charges likely in bombing

WASHINGTON (AP) — Investigators "have plenty of leads" and may bring charges against more people in the Oklahoma City bombing case, the Justice Department's No. 2 official said Thursday.

Deputy Attorney General Jamie Gorelick expressed confidence everyone involved will be caught.

At the same time, she became the first official to publicly demand anonymity — that John Doe No. 2, the heaviest man depicted in three FBI sketches and sought in a nationwide manhunt, may not have been an active participant in the April 19 bombing that killed 168 people at the Alfred P. Murrah federal building.

"We have plenty of leads ... I would not foreclose the possibility of additional defendants at some time in the future," Gorelick told a news conference where she was substituting for Attorney General Janet Reno.

"But I would not predict when that might be or with any certainty."

## Protestor's son charged for fire at high school

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) — The son of a black protest leader was arrested Thursday on charges of burning down a high school where a white principal's stand against mixed-race dating had caused months of racial turmoil.

Christopher Lynn Johnson, 25, of Ashland, was charged with setting the Aug. 6 fire at Randolph County High School in Wedowee.

Before the blaze, Johnson's father, Emmett, had helped form a "Freedom School" for black students boycotting classes. He also formed a group he called a Black Panther Militia, saying it was for self-defense.

A federal grand jury indicted the younger Johnson on charges of arson and possessing a destructive device — a paper bag containing kerosene-soaked matchbooks and soil. He could get up to 20 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine.

U.S. Attorney Redding Pitt would not say what led investigators to Johnson, a worker at a chicken processing plant. The indictment was delayed two weeks until the end of the school year, so as not to disrupt classes, Pitt said.

## Not just gentlemen prefer new stamp

UNIVERSAL CITY, Calif. (AP) — With a touch of Hollywood pizzazz, the U.S. Postal Service unveiled the Marilyn Monroe nostalgic industry Thursday, issuing a 32-stamp bearing the image of the movie bombshell.

An unveiling ceremony attended by Monroe's co-stars was held at Universal Studios, coinciding with what would have been her 69th birthday.

In a packed theater, U.S. Postmaster Marvin Runyon stepped back to reveal a floor-to-ceiling version of the stamp as Monroe's voice cued "I Wanna Be Loved By You."

"In every poster, picture and production, she cast a spell," Runyon said. The new stamp, whose design was made public earlier, depicts Monroe, who died in 1962, at the height of her glamour, striking a sultry, slightly over-the-shoulder pose. She wears a glittery gold gown against a deep blue background.

The stamp, the first in what is to be a series on "Legends of Hollywood," was designed by artist Michael Deas.

Among those on hand were Monroe co-stars Eli Wallach, Don Murray, Hope Lange and Zsa Zsa Gabor. Wallach said he imagined Monroe was looking down on the scene and remarking "God, they've given me a stamp. Men have been stamping on me all my life, and now I'll get a chance to stamp on them."

While the main ceremonies surrounding the Monroe issue were here, other cities got into the act as well. In Oklahoma City, postal workers dressed in outfits from the '50s. They had a standup outfit of Monroe, a juke box playing old songs. They gave away popcorn as they sold the stamps.

Long Beach, stamp collectors Yujii Oami of Japan and B.H. Lim of Hong Kong paid a combined \$6,400 for the first 20,000 Marilyn stamps issued there.

### Advice to militiamen: Get a hobby, get a life

Recent events in Bosnia may require rethinking by the firebrands leading America's militia movement.

Fear of a United Nations invasion is the cornerstone of the militiamen's paranoid theology. They've told everybody that U.N. troops are poised to sweep through America, disarming patriots and outlawing apple pie, or whatever.

But if the U.N. can't oust a bunch of third-rate hick-the-Serbs, it certainly can't pose a credible threat to the good ol' US of A. What a disappointment to the militia boys.

On the other hand, maybe they have some deep, consoling explanation for the U.N.'s problems. Like, maybe Bosnia is just a diversion, to lull U.S. patriots into complacency. Before we know it, those black helicopters will be flocking overhead. Any day now the U.N. tanks will be rolling down the interstate, guided by mysterious stickers on the backs of freeway signs.

Which raises another question. The militia guys keep saying those stickers are supposed to guide the foreign invasion forces. Seems like a lot of trouble. Why can't the U.N.'s tank commanders just get road maps from AAA, and read the fronts of the signs?

But the red-hots probably have an answer for that, too. The Gang That Can't Think Straight has an answer for everything, and each answer is goofier than the last.

What raises yet another question: Why are the national media paying so much attention to these noisy misfits?

The answer is, because they're well-armed militias, and because they keep talking about even if their ideas are too bizarre to take seriously, their belligerence commands attention.

The militia movement is the latest eruption of an old, old streak of American radicalism. The members are the white separatists, the religious proselytizers, the Birchers and the old Posse Comitatus.

Some are less ideological - just fat, old, white guys who don't want to pay their taxes. But they've been inflamed by the presence of a liberal in the

White House, and they've been encouraged by great waves of irresponsible "drivel" spewing out of radio talk shows.

Their underlying philosophy, as far as we can tell, is: "We don't have to do anything we don't want to do. Any law that says otherwise is evil." With this basic resentment already in place, they're primed to believe demagogues who tell them the government is stripping away their rights.

Such warnings come as a surprise to those of us who aren't waiting to rendezvous with the Mother Ship. We've all been laboring under the impression that the United States is one of the freest countries in history, and that our government, for all its faults, generally does what voters tell it to do. (It's difficult to get that now, courtesy of Newt Gingrich and his GOP congressional colleagues.)

But the militias' radicals don't believe America is a free country. They point to the Branch Davidians and Randy Weaver as proof that the government is out to get honest patriots. What they forget is, Weaver and David Koresh went looking for trouble.

Granted, government agencies screwed up in both cases - a fact later confirmed by federal investigations. The truth is, federal agencies are fallible.

When radicals barge into someone's inside compounds and vow not to be taken alive, can anyone really be surprised if overexcited cops make lethal mistakes?

If the militiamen are sure on their martyrdom, you can be intense they'll be OK, sooner or later. That would be ACHIEVE, except that innocent people are bound to get hurt.

The other problem is the damage they do to their home states' reputations. To millions of Americans, the states of Michigan, Montana and Idaho are becoming synonymous with lunacy.

We'd all be better off - militiamen and plain folk alike - if the red-hots would find calmer hobbies. Maybe, or bridge. Anything to take their minds off their irrational fears.

Get lives, boys. Get lives.



## Slicing through baloney about Enola Gay

When Martin Harwit resigned the other day as director of the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum, a news magazine called him "the Enola Gay's final casualty." Which is baloney, since I know you will. No, what did Mr. Harwit was another crew, one accurately labeled years ago by former U.N. Ambassador Jean Kirkpatrick as "the Blame America First" crowd.

This group, the politically correct revisionists of American history, have tried since the 1960s to "deconstruct" that history. A better term for the agenda of counterculture academicism is "the hijacking of American history."

The process has been going on for years on campus, but with the Enola Gay fiasco the general public got to see how the "Blame America First" gang give history an anti-American spin.

An exhibit of the Enola Gay was devised by several of these propagandists that, according to the Air Force Association, "had 49 photos of Japanese casualties but only three photos of American casualties," showing the "crucians' intent to emphasize Japanese suffering."

A revised script gave "less than one text page - out of a total of 295 text pages - to Japanese military activity prior to 1945." As the association reminds us, that activity included "Japan's 15-year war of atrocity and aggression; Pearl Harbor; the Bataan Death March; the torture and killing of POWs and all the rest."

In recent Senate hearings on the fiasco, the Air Force Association testified that it wanted to stomp the "Blame America First" points: "That the Japanese were victims in World War II, defying their nation against Western aggression; that the Americans were ruthless invaders, driven by racism, revenge and blood lust; that the death, suffering and horrors of war were borne unilaterally and unfairly by a passive Japan; (and) that the roles of Japan and the United States in World War II were mutually equivalent."

Americans not only visit the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum in



greater numbers than any other museum in Washington, they also support it with their tax money.

And the museum was planning to tell them that Hiroshima and Nagasaki amounted to a Pacific rim Holocaust visited on the poor, inflexible Japanese by - you guessed it - Americans in the role as the nasty Nazis.

That is an odd parody of the one Asian nation that in fact proclaimed itself an Axis partner with the Hitler regime that committed the real Holocaust. And that was prior to Pearl Harbor. That war, many recall, began with a Japanese sneak attack on the United States while Japanese envoys were negotiating in Washington.

The Japanese had started their own war against their fellow Asians years earlier. A nation whose army perpetrated the Rape of Nanking is a strange choice for the role of innocent-victim of racist violence.

The "Blame America First" crowd quickly learned it is hard to sell counterculture history to a generation that knows the real thing. Bill Cooper of Dallas was one of the leaders of the national protest that sprang up among the millions of Americans who actually fought that war, who were eyewitnesses to the real events of the 1940s. Mr. Cooper was flying B29 missions 50 years ago. Like the other veterans who know the real thing, Bill Cooper of Dallas was one of the leaders of the national protest that sprang up among the millions of Americans who actually fought that war, who were eyewitnesses to the real events of the 1940s. Mr. Cooper was flying B29 missions 50 years ago. Like the other veterans who know the real thing, a delegation will visit Harry Truman's grave on the anniversary of the Enola Gay mission and honor his decision to drop the bomb.

Hundreds of thousands, probably millions, of older Americans and Japanese who have lived the post-half-century owe that fact to Mr. Truman's moral courage. The hard decision fell to a man who in his younger days was a fire-eating battery commander, a combat veteran of World War I.

Unlike the PC crowd today, Mr. Truman knew from personal experience what Americans waiting to invade the Japanese homeland were facing.

Those "Blame America First" types now hope to convince us that the Japanese in 1945 were pitiful, exhausted victims of aggression; yearning to surrender and end the war. They skip over the unavoidable facts of history, such as the human cost of that final and bloodiest year of the war. All of the U.S. armed forces involved in the long war in the Pacific suffered the majority of their casualties in those last 12 months. The 1945 Japanese too were to fight on? Tell that to the Marines, who took 78 percent of their casualties and 75 percent of their deaths that year.

In his Dec. 8, 1941, "day of infamy" speech to Congress, Franklin D. Roosevelt declared that Americans "always" will remember "the character of that attack" on our fleet at Pearl Harbor.

The "Blame America First" crowd may not remember, but America's seniors certainly do, and their reaction to the "Blame America First" scam was positively volcanic.

That is one reason the Smithsonian has a new regret, Rep. Sam Johnson of Plano, Texas, courtesy of the new GOP congressional majority. Older Americans examined the guilt trip that Harwit & Co. were reserving for us all and asked themselves that old World War II question, "Is this trip REALLY necessary?"

The answer, loud and clear, was "No!" So they won't go, but Mr. Harwit will. And, about time, too.

**House dirties Clean Water Act**

A majority of the House of Representatives, including Rep. Crump, voted recently to weaken the 1972 Clean Water Act. This law has been dramatically successful in cleaning up our nation's lakes and streams.

According to the Natural Resources Defense Council in 1972, only one-third of the bodies of water in America were safe for fishing and swimming. Today, almost two-thirds are safe.

Many bodies of water such as Puget Sound that were significantly damaged from pollution are greatly improved. Consider the benefits conferred by restoring the health of our waterways in Idaho; the Boise River, which was once fouled by raw sewage, garbage and slaughterhouse waste, is once again a pristine river paralleled by a beautiful greenbelt enjoyed by thousands of people.

Yet one does not have to look far to see evidence of neglect; a glaring example is the algae-bloom fiasco that is the Snake River below Twin Falls. Thus, it is baffling to find that the House's answer to such continuing problems is to weaken controls on agricultural run-off, reduce enforcement

standards for industrial and municipal wastes, and weaken requirements on factories to treat pollution discharged into public sewer systems.

Congress would like to turn over some of these protective functions to the states, apparently believing that local authorities will do a better job. One example calls into question this leap of faith: Idaho's Division of Environmental Quality has had 16 years to produce a list of degraded streams in the state, and although 962 stream segments are said to be polluted, the DEQ has so far designated only a fraction of them.

The Senate will take up this bill sometime in the future. Idahoans may want to let their senators know that it is unacceptable to turn back the clock to the time when our lakes and streams were so open to convenient sewers. Some who opposed the recent changes in the Clean Water Act were branded as "environmental extremists"; apparently an "environmentalist" is one who has an aversion to drinking, swimming in or fishing in waters contaminated by toxic chemicals, sewage or other pollutants.

# West rejects hostage talks; food runs low in Sarajevo

**SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina (AP)**—Western allies refused to deal with the Bosnian Serbs and pushed instead Thursday for a rapid deployment force to add muscle to their diplomatic efforts to free hundreds of hostage peacekeepers.

Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic warned that any attempt to rescue some 370 U.N. peacekeepers being held by the Serbs would result in butchery.

On the ground, the situation grew even more precarious as a Swedish U.N. civilian official was detained, Sarajevo ran short of food, and fighting flared in the east and northeast.

The pilot of a French fighter jet on reconnaissance over Bosnia reported a surface-to-air missile was fired, but NATO officials said they didn't know if the aircraft was the target. It was not hit.

The United States dismissed Serb overtures for talks on the hostage crisis, but sent a top envoy to try to persuade Serbian President Slobodan Milosevic to initiate his former Bosnia's protest by recognizing Bosnia's Muslim-led government.

The Serb rebels had called for immediate negotiations on the hostages seized after NATO bombing raids last week — but insisted that NATO guarantee there would be no more airstrikes before the peacekeepers would be freed.

"We are not prepared to go into talks on that basis," Secretary of State Warren Christopher said Thursday in Lisbon, Portugal.

Speaking on Bosnian Serb television, Karadzic warned against any attempt to rescue the peacekeepers.

"We constantly change their loca-

tion," Karadzic said, adding that any rescue attempt "would resemble a butcher's shop. We must defend ourselves."

He again claimed that the detained U.N. soldiers were "POWs because their commander ordered NATO bombings." But he added, "They are in good condition and I can send a message to their families that nothing will happen to them."

Karadzic repeated demands that U.N. "safe areas" be demilitarized and that clandestine arms shipments

to the government be ended as conditions for releasing the peacekeepers.

In Belgrade, U.S. envoy Robert Frasure offered new concessions to Milosevic, the region's power broker, that would significantly lift U.N. trade sanctions and provide financial incentives if he recognizes Bosnia, sources said. The sanctions were imposed on Serbia for inciting the war in Bosnia.

Hinting at potential rewards, which could include loans from international banks, Christopher said that "it would be useful to him in the future if he does emphasize that he is no longer an ally of the Pale Serbs."

British Defense Secretary Malcolm Rifkind, meanwhile, said Britain and France would establish a rapid-reaction strike force to protect peacekeepers that would be "robustly equipped to counter potential attacks on U.N. personnel."

Formation of the strike force will be discussed by diplomats in Paris this weekend and by meeting of NATO defense ministers next week.

Rifkind also welcomed President Clinton's new flexibility in offering to send U.S. ground troops to Bosnia to help redeploy U.N. peacekeepers — not just to pull them out.

"It is certainly a significant change in the American position," he said.

Foreign Office minister Douglas Hogg said he expects Americans to be asked to help redeploy some peacekeeping troops.

More British soldiers and equipment arrived in Split, on Croatia's Adriatic coast, following Britain's decision to send up to 6,200 soldiers to reinforce and defend peacekeepers.

## No money forces U.S. firefighters out of Bosnia

**ZAGREB, Croatia** — In all their grief and terror and despair, it was one of the few tangible signs that anyone in the United States ever really cared — a grassroots effort that a senior U.S. diplomat recently called America's most visible and vital presence in the killing field that is Sarajevo.

Since the slaughter in Bosnia began more than three years and 200,000 victims ago, they were the only Americans not sleeping ever saw, and they saw them when they needed them most — at midnight, when their homes were set ablaze by Serbian artillery fire, or at noon when the cobblestone streets of their marketplaces ran crimson with the blood of their dead and dying.

But what began more than 2½ years ago as the Rhode Island Volunteer Group — a fire/rescue operation that survived the longest

siege in modern warfare — has finally succumbed: not to last week's unremitting sniper fire and withering artillery bombardment, but to bureaucratic red tape and government apathy.

"The catastrophe" that State Department official Richard C. Holbrook vowed only six weeks ago he would never permit to occur has now, happened. The Rhode Island-based volunteer effort that eventually became a mainstay of U.N. rescue operations in the besieged Bosnian capital is being shut down, at least temporarily.

Despite assurances to Congress by Holbrook, assistant secretary of state for European and Canadian affairs, that, with United Nations funds drying up, he would somehow find the money to keep the operation going, Newport, R.I.'s John Jordan said, he was being forced to "pull the plug" and withdraw his volunteers from Sarajevo.

## U.S. carrier ready for anything in Bosnia

**NEWPORT NEWS, Va.** — The USS Theodore Roosevelt, joined by at least four other Hampton Roads-based ships in the Adriatic Sea, are launching as many as 80 flights a day in support of U.N. operations over Bosnia, the aircraft carrier's commander said Wednesday.

"We are in it heightened sense of awareness, obviously," said Capt. Ronald L. Christenson, interviewed by telephone as he observed flight operations from the carrier's bridge Wednesday.

"The crew is excited. We've trained so hard, there's an excitement to the fact that we're actually performing those functions we've trained for. It makes it professionally satisfying," he said.

The Roosevelt, in nearly the center of the Adriatic, is joined by the amphibious ships Kearsarge, Nashville and Pensacola, carrying a total of 2,200 special-operations-qualified Marines from Camp Lejeune, N.C. They have been joined by the guided-missile destroyer Arleigh Burke, from Norfolk, and the Charleston, S.C.-based destroyer John Rodgers.

More ships are on the way. The guided-missile frigate Hawes, also from Charleston, was scheduled to arrive Thursday. Navy spokesmen said, by the weekend, the cruiser Hue City, from Mayport, Fla., will arrive. The Norfolk-based cruiser Mississippi is also en route to the Adriatic, but the Navy couldn't say when it will arrive. The remain-

der of the Roosevelt group's 14 ships are training with NATO allies or on port calls, Christenson said.

The Roosevelt has trained extensively with special operations forces, launching Army helicopters during 1994 training operations. Asked if he had taken on additional special forces, Christenson said, "The crew is excited. We've trained so hard, there's an excitement to the fact that we're actually performing those functions we've trained for."

U.N.-ordered attacks on Serbian positions. The remainder are standard training flights, Christenson said.

Christenson characterized the threat to his immediate battle group as low. But despite what is generally the best weather of the year in this part of the world, he said his pilots are sometimes encountering rough weather as they fly missions over the war-torn country.

"It varies day to day," Christenson said. "The weather system has been putting layers of clouds at the beach. We have had fog the last couple of days." And an "inverted trough" he said, "is causing rapid buildups of thunderstorms over the mountains." Christenson said he couldn't discuss the specifics of the Sharp Guard missions being flown by his pilots. But, he said, "We fly all sorts of operations; and we do train to do that kind of mission. We are capable of performing everything."

The Roosevelt and its amphibious ships arrived in the Adriatic on May 25. "We had a NATO exercise just south of Sicily, and we were ordered to make best speed up to the Adriatic," Christenson said.

The movement caused the crew to miss a scheduled port call to Naples, Italy, Christenson said. Despite that, he said, morale is good.

"It's my job to say everything's great," he said. "But it really is. The crew has responded wonderfully." The crew's response, he said, has been "exceeding professional."

## U.S., Portugal extend use of Azores islands base

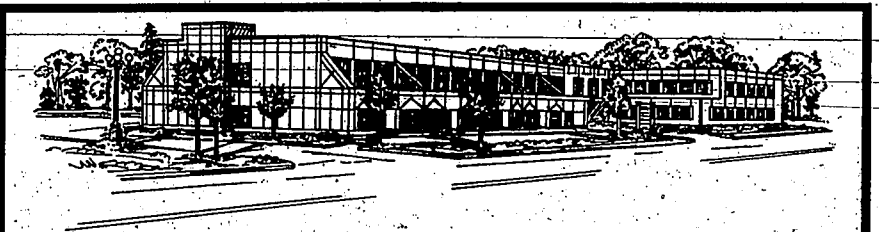
**LISBON, Portugal (AP)** — The United States and Portugal signed a treaty Thursday allowing Washington to use the strategic Lajes air base for another five years.

Lajes, on Portugal's mid-Atlantic Azores islands, was a key staging base for U.S. airborne missions to the Middle East and northern Africa during the Gulf War. It also could be used during any U.S. operation to support NATO allies in Bosnia.

Secretary of State Warren Christopher and his Portuguese counterpart, Jose Manuel Durao Barroso, signed four accords on using the base on Terceira island, 1,200 miles west of the Portuguese mainland and 3,300 miles east of Washington.

The accords are valid for the next five years and can be renewed annually thereafter.

The first Lajes treaty was signed in 1951. The treaty was renewed in 1983 and has been extended annually since 1989.

## Iraq refuses to work with U.N. inspectors

MANAMA, Bahrain (AP) — Iraq has refused to account for 17 tons of material that could be used to make enough biological weapons to "kill the world four times over," the U.N. chief weapons inspector said Thursday.

Ambassador Rolf Ekeus said Baghdad first wanted "assurances" of a more favorable stand toward Iraq in the U.N. Security Council before disclosing any information.

Ekeus spoke to reporters on his return from a four-day visit to Iraq. Bahrain is the regional headquarters of the U.N. Special Commission, which has been supervising the dismantling of Iraq's non-conventional weapons since the end of the 1991 Gulf War.

The visit was not a complete failure, he said.

His team was able to account for 200 tons of chemical warfare materi-

al, also a source of serious concern. Ekeus said his inspectors also cleared a mystery over some 200 missiles with the exception of one.

However, Ekeus said, "it became very clear from the beginning that Iraq was not ready to discuss in substance the matter of biological weapons," specifically the 17 tons of material, possible precursors for germ warfare.

The missing material, he said, could produce germs "enough to kill the world four times over."

Ekeus said Iraq apparently wants to see how the Security Council will react to its cooperation on the other weapons. Ekeus is scheduled to report to the council on June 19.

Baghdad has accused Washington of "exploiting the weapons issue to keep Iraq a prisoner of the embargo imposed after Iraq's August 1990 invasion of Kuwait."

## Colombia health center gives HIV to 9 people

LONDON (AP) — A dialysis center in Colombia spread the virus that causes AIDS to nine patients because it reused needles that weren't properly disinfected, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said.

The clinic had reused needles and equipment after rinsing them with a weak disinfectant that does not kill HIV, investigators from the Atlanta-based center said.

HIV was transmitted to nine of 10 patients who were treated at the same time as a patient with AIDS.

The report, which does not identify the center, will be published in Saturday's issue of The Lancet, a medical journal.

The risk of transmitting HIV at dialysis centers in the United States and western Europe is minimal because needles are not

reused and powerful disinfectants are used to sterilize equipment, said Dr. Nathan Levin, chief of nephrology at Beth Israel Medical Center in New York City.

HIV has never been transmitted among patients in American dialysis centers, the Centers for Disease Control said.

However, "the practice of reprocessing intravascular devices, such as needles, with a low-level disinfectant... may not be uncommon in developing countries," Dr. Scott Fridkin, one of the investigators, said in a telephone interview.

"We know this has happened in Egypt and there's anecdotal evidence in Argentina and now documented evidence in Colombia," Fridkin said.

## Ebola deaths rise, but virus under control

GENEVA (AP) — The death toll in Zaire from the Ebola virus has risen to 164, but the acute phase of the epidemic is over, the World Health Organization said Thursday.

A few new cases are expected from people still in the incubation

period, "but transmission seems now to be completely halted," the agency said in a statement.

The fatality rate for the disease remains about 75 percent, it said, and the total number of cases, including deaths, has risen to 211.

## N. Korea moves people from capital

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Worried about its capital's growing population, North Korea has reportedly begun moving hundreds of thousands of people out of the city, Pyongyang.

South Korean newspapers, quoting a high-ranking government official, reported Thursday that the relocation program could force as many as 1 million citizens to move back to the much poorer countryside.

They said Pyongyang's population has risen sharply in recent years — to 3.5 million — as North Koreans moved there to seek better food rations and housing.

Defectors from the Communist North all have brought stories of acute food shortages, saying people in the countryside make do with a bowl of gruel a day. Moving to Pyongyang is a big dream for country people, who often bribe corrupt Communist Party officials to get the necessary papers.

Just last week, North Korea acknowledged its food crisis for the first time to the outside world and asked Japan for emergency food aid.

The South Korean official, who briefed reporters on condition of anonymity, said North Korean authorities were telling people the relocation aims to ease labor shortages in farming and industry. But politics was a bigger motive for the policy change, he said.

Migration from the countryside has brought more diverse voices to Pyongyang, raising fears among Communist leaders that its bastion of party loyalty might become politically unstable, he said.

The official said South Korea learned of the relocation effort from recent travelers to the North and other sources. North Korea is among the world's most tightly sealed societies, and many reports about it cannot be independently confirmed.

In the past, the North had filled its capital with Communist party members and sustained their loyalty with privileges. But widespread corruption has left loopholes in what used to be tight control on population movements, South Korean officials said.

## Police find LSD at cult facility

TOKYO (AP) — The cult accused of releasing nerve gas on Tokyo's subways was trying to add several more weapons to its deadly arsenal — bazookas, lasers and assault weapons, police and news reports said Thursday.

Police also found ingredients of the hallucinogenic drug LSD hidden inside a pillar at the Aum Shinri Kyo cult's compound near Mount Fuji, the NHK public broadcasting network said.

It said police believe the cult gave LSD and other drugs to members during religious rituals.

Police said Thursday they found bazooka barrels, assault weapons parts and grenades at the cult's facilities.

Police reportedly suspect the cult was developing a military wing to try to overthrow the government.

### Closure of Buhl dump hasn't caused problems, officials say

**BUHL** — County commissioners say they haven't encountered too many problems since they were forced to close the Buhl dump last week.

State officials toured the site five miles west of Buhl last week and found the dump was overflowing with garbage. They told the county either to close it immediately or to modify it by adding more landfill space.

Commissioner Dennis Murchan said modifying the dump would have been too costly, especially since a transfer station is supposed to be ready to open at the site in August.

The county Buhl had been receiving all the county's garbage for nine months last year while the county built a new landfill site at Hub Butte, south of Twin Falls.

All trash is now to be taken to the Hub Butte landfill near 2800 E. 3100'N. Its hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Saturdays.

### Fish and Game says winter kills have been low in deer population

**TWIN FALLS** — The Idaho Department of Fish and Game has reported winter kill averages for the past two winters were relatively low in the southwest area of the state.

Overall, only 7 percent of all bucks and 8 percent of all does died during each of the past two winters in southwest Idaho.

"High survivability means good numbers of mature bucks and two-point bucks will be available for the region's 1995 mule deer hunting season," Jim Unsworth, a Fish and Game research biologist, said in a news release.

Similar findings have been reported across the state. This year's wet spring produced excellent forage, which quickly put mule deer into prime condition. The extended green-up period also should yield high fawn production and survival rates.

Big game hunting regulations will be available by June 1, and the application period for controlled hunts will run from June 1 through June 30. Resident deer tags will be available at Fish and Game offices and license vendors starting in August, and more than 5,000 non-resident deer tags are still available. Lamb-Weston foots entire '95 bill, but less for '96

**TWIN FALLS** — Twin Falls residents will enjoy a \$10,000 fireworks display on July 4, thanks to a gift from Lamb-Weston Inc.

But the Kennewick, Wash., based potato processing company says Magic Valley businesses will need to chip in come 1996 if they want the impressive fireworks show to continue.

In past years, Universal Frozen Foods sponsored the area's Independence Day pyrotechnics, footing the entire \$10,000 bill.

But Lamb-Weston purchased UFF 10 months ago, leaving the future of the fireworks display in doubt. In May, Lamb-Weston said it would give \$2,500 for the show.

Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce members scrambled to raise the rest of the money.

They didn't have to scramble long, however. Lamb-Weston officials reconsidered, agreeing to pay the entire cost.

"Since it was kind of short notice for

the community to get other individuals involved this year, rather than not have a program, the company was willing to sponsor the program one more year and make sure we have a fireworks program," Lamb-Weston plant manager Mike Johnston said Thursday.

Chamber President Ruth Stevens says Lamb-Weston's decision is "great news."

"I think it's great if they want to continue to provide support for one more

year. That's wonderful," Stevens said.

And Lamb-Weston is promising to back the program after 1995. The corporation is pledging \$2,500 a year to boost the fireworks program.

Meanwhile, the Chamber is developing a plan to make sure future Independence Days have fireworks.

Johnston hopes other businesses will be generous. Lamb-Weston's Independence Day celebration bailout gives "other companies in Twin Falls a year to plan," according to Johnston.

"Hopefully, it will get a lot of support," he said.

## Formal DOE plan still sends nuclear waste to INEL

### O'Leary foresees resolution; Batt vows not to back down

**BOISE** — Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary Thursday formalized the Clinton administration's decision to resume shipping highly radioactive waste to the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

The action would send 1,950 shipments of spent — but still highly radioactive — nuclear reactor fuel on their way across the country to Idaho. The shipments would equal 165 tons of radioactive waste on top of the existing inventory of 261 tons already stored at INEL.

"Waste trains are massed, and Idaho is being railroaded," said Kerry Cooke, spokeswoman for the statewide nuclear watchdog group Snake River Alliance.

The waste would be stored at INEL, which sits atop the Snake River Plain Aquifer, the sole water supply for much of southern Idaho.

But for now, the shipments remain blocked by a federal court injunction.

O'Leary expressed optimism Thursday that a resolution could be found to overcome Idaho's objections to resumption of nuclear waste shipments to INEL.

Gov. Phil Batt reinforced his intention to use everything possible to block new shipments.

"The signing of that document does not alter our course of action," Batt declared.

Batt, who suffered a political lashing in January for not being adamant enough in opposing further nuclear waste storage at INEL, has said that his administration might physically block entry of any waste trailers into the state.

In signing the so-called record of decision required by a 1993 federal court order, O'Leary acknowledged that resumption of waste shipments will not occur until the lifting of a federal court injunction. Batt obtained by arguing that needed waste storage would result in environmental damage.

"I am hopeful," O'Leary said, "that we will reach an equitable resolution with Idaho on this matter that is

responsive to both state interests and national needs."

The record of decision formally adopts the conclusion of a comprehensive environmental impact statement on the department's national waste management operations and the waste management operations at INEL specifically.

This decision represents a balanced consideration of potential environmental risks, public concerns and cost-effective management while supporting continued successful operation of the Navy nuclear fleet," O'Leary said.

The Navy has sent spent fuel from its nuclear powered ships to INEL since the mid-1950s.

Now the (Department of Energy) says we're going to get 1,950 more shipments of spent fuel and will become a regional center for other kinds of nuclear waste," Cooke says. "DOE, we say 'no thanks.'"

In addition to using INEL for storage Navy waste, the decision calls for storage of commercially generated waste from Colorado Public Service Co.'s Fort St. Vrain reactor. Batt has admitted stopping resumption of Navy waste shipments may be difficult, but he has been confident that, like his predecessor Cecil Andrus, he will be able to keep the commercial waste out of the state.

Some waste from the Fort St. Vrain reactor and other commercial reactors operated in partnership with the Energy Department already is stored at INEL — as are the remains of the destroyed core of the Three Mile Island.

## Energy consultant visits area, blasts agency on nuclear-waste policy

**TWIN FALLS** — The federal Energy Department should stop wasting time — and money — on a long-range storage site for high-level nuclear waste, a critic of federal energy policy said Thursday.

In fact, the Energy Department shouldn't even be allowed to set nuclear waste policy, because it is a producer of nuclear waste, said Arjun Makhijani, president of the Institute for Energy and Environmental Research, a Washington D.C.-based consulting firm.

"They have too many conflicts of interest," Makhijani told Twin Falls reporters during a visit sponsored by the Snake River Alliance. The alliance is a statewide citizen's group that tracks nuclear threats to Idaho.

Instead of letting the Energy Department set policy for nuclear waste disposal, Makhijani proposed a Blue Ribbon Coalition appointed by President Clinton — to study the disposal issue and make recommendations.

Billions of dollars and years of effort already have been consumed by a proposal for a high-level nuclear waste disposal site at

Yucca Mountain, Nev., he said. The project is a virtual "black hole" for money because the expected opening date keeps being pushed back, he said.

In Makhijani's view, the best thing to do with nuclear waste is to store it where it was produced.

"It's worse to be moving it around," he said. Instead of transporting it, the Energy Department ought to pay nuclear power plant operators to store their wastes on-site, he said.

Such an approach would spare the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory, near Arco, from accepting hundreds of shipments of highly radioactive wastes from nuclear reactors around the country and abroad.

Forcing politically weak states to accept nuclear waste is a losing proposition because states on the receiving end are fed up with their role as dumping grounds — and are taking the Energy Department to court.

"It's a bad program," Makhijani said. "We've got people stirring around on the deck of a sinking ship."

"I don't think it makes sense to deal with materials with radioactive half-lives of thousands of years in Idaho. That's not a good way to manage nuclear waste," he said.

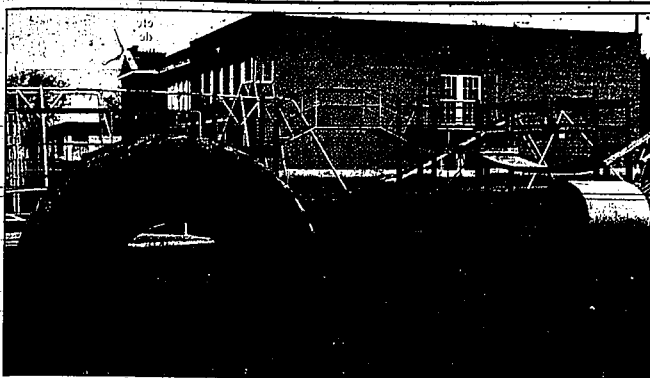

**Closed school will keep playground**

**BURLEY** — The new owner of Overland Elementary School has plans for a warehouse and new automobile dealership, but he will leave the playground open for neighborhood children.

Jim Lynch, owner of Lynch Oil Inc., said he will use the school building as a storage facility for his Magic Ice Co. until his plans for a new car business come through.

A new car dealership is probably six years away, he said, having to wait until other business is completed in Lynch Oil.

With the opening of White Pine Intermediate School this fall, Overland and South West elementary schools were closed this summer. Students from those two schools will attend Mountain View Elementary next fall.

Setting aside liability fears, Lynch said he is encouraging public use of the property.

"The playground will stay open, he said, until long range plans, such as a car lot, come together.

"We just want to try and help the community," Lynch said.

Keeping the playground open is not the only civic-minded act Lynch has committed since buying the former elementary school.

After buying the school for an undisclosed price, Lynch donated nearly \$10,000 worth of kitchen equipment, including ovens and refrigeration system, to the school district.

"As a father and member of the Cassia County School District school-to-work committee, Lynch said merchants have to help the local youth.

"I think as businesspeople, we have to help pay the price. We can't leave these kids out there with nothing to do," he said.

"I've always really loved cars. I felt, someday, I wanted our family to expand its business into the automobile business," Lynch said.

Lynch Oil Inc. was started in 1923. Lynch, who holds a doctorate in economics, took over the company from his father in the late 1980s.

**Tax cap may put bite on Cassia employees**

**BURLEY** — Cassia County employees may not see a cost of living increase in their salaries come October — the county is restricted by a 3 percent property tax cap.

The 1995 Legislature set the tax cap that will force taxing districts to keep their budgets from rising more than 3 percent, unless they ask voters to approve a higher tax.

Commissioner Paul Christensen said county departments are starting to fill out their budget requests now. No cost of living increase in county employees' salaries is a possibility, he said, while budget cuts haven't been talked about, yet.

County Administrator Tim Hurst said inflation costs this year already have pushed the budget up 2.7 percent over 1995's fiscal year.

"The biggest factor is going to be the juvenile justice system," Hurst said.

The Legislature also mandated counties to fund juvenile corrections, something that has been done by the Department of Health and Welfare.

"We don't know if we are going to have to use added property taxes to fund it," Hurst said.

A new judicial building estimated to cost \$6.9 million also complicates budgeting, Hurst said. The item has been deemed a mandatory need by a resident's committee and commissioners have put it on their priority list.

A new building would have to be

funded by a bond issue, which means more taxes for property owners, Hurst said.

"People want government to do more things for them, but more services won't be feasible," he said.

Cassia County increased property taxes by 7 percent for fiscal year 1995 and 5 percent for 1994, Hurst said, and didn't have a juvenile justice system to worry about then.

Minidoka County Assessor Max Vaughn, who said it will be difficult to determine how property taxes will rise until Minidoka County passes its budget, feels the tax cap is appropriate.

"It's going to really tighten the belts," he said, noting it will force taxing districts to justify spending more than they had in the past.

Continued from B1 — Island reactor that underwent a partial meltdown — outside Harrisburg, Pa., in 1979.

Waste has been accumulating at INEL — under what the federal government has called temporary storage — for more than 40 years.

"Until Idaho has an assurance that we are not to be the final repository for our nation's nuclear waste, we cannot allow more shipments into our state," Batt said in a statement.

"I want to protect employment and economic opportunities for eastern Idahoans," Batt said. "I also want to protect the environment. The best way to do all this is to ensure that material will be treated when it comes in and ensure that Idaho has a definitive time line as to when it will leave."

O'Leary's action contemplates intensifying waste cleanup at INEL and construction of regional waste treatment facility that would prepare radioactive material for final disposition.

And that raises questions with the Alliance.

"We're afraid the department is offering the state mixed waste and spent fuel processing facilities in return for the state-dropping the suit" that resulted in the injunction, Cooke said.

The governor has said that he would stop fighting new shipments when the government has a reasonable schedule for opening a permanent dump outside Idaho and there are substantial monetary penalties for failing to meet that schedule.

But he also has said he doubts the government can come up with such an enforceable schedule.

Continued from B1 parcels' each year. The remaining 80 percent are "indexed" up or down according to real estate sales figures to determine the parcel's market value, Bowden said.

"The value we're putting on is the figure that you would get if you turned around and sold it," Bowden said. "That is the value you're going to be taxed on."

Property owners with questions about their assessment can look to the assessor's office for answers, or have a second appraisal done on their property.

The office is on the third floor of the courthouse. The phone number is 736-4010.

Those who still question their assessments can file an appeal with the county commissioners. The deadline is June 26.

**Rec center raises questions in Rupert**

**RUPERT** — Some people say if a private company won't open a recreation center in Minidoka County, and the community wants one, the government can step in and use tax money to make it happen.

Others say it would be a misuse of tax money.

A 235-household random telephone survey conducted last month in Minidoka County showed that 55 percent of the respondents would be willing to pay more taxes for a recreation district. About 17 percent of contacted households did not participate in the survey.

The survey was conducted by the Minidoka Recreation Committee with the help of Idaho State University. The recreation committee is a group of more than 30 Minidoka County residents interested in establishing a recreation center north of the Snake River.

Les Hutchinson, committee member and director of the Rupert Parks and Recreation Department, said Thursday that no private company has been willing to start a recreation club in Minidoka County.

"If the private sector doesn't do it, and it is needed in your community then it should be done if people vote it in," Hutchinson said.

But Anne Blayney, a Rupert resident, says she doesn't feel using tax

money to fund a recreational center is good use of public funds.

"I have a lot of concerns about it being a taxpayer funded facility when I don't really know if the taxpayers will get the most benefit," Blayney said.

According to Hutchinson, the project is a long-way off, and funding a center could come down to a bond issue or grants.

Initial estimated costs to build a center with an indoor pool range between \$2 million and \$3 million, he said.

"This is a pipe dream, and we're just in the embryo stages," Hutchinson said, noting that it could be at least five years before anything materializes.

But before a public recreation center can be built, 20 percent of the electorate must sign a petition to place a recreation district on the ballot, he said. Only a simple majority must vote in favor of the district, which would be the entire county.

The governor must appoint three recreation board directors, who would have the authority to assess taxes for public recreation services in the district, Hutchinson said.

Board members also would be responsible for setting user fees for the center.

Residents who want a new pool and larger gymnasium started showing up at parks department meetings

and asking that something be done, he said. The pool was built in 1949 and is in poor condition, he said.

People say the gymnasium isn't large enough to run all their programs, he said.

But the survey included more than a pool and a gymnasium, favored along with a weight room by a majority of the respondents.

Between 35 and 43 percent of the respondents favored a game room, racquetball courts, a concession area, a performing arts auditorium, craft room, day care area for users, multipurpose meeting rooms and an indoor track.

Blayney feels that such services amount to a hand-out and that people should turn to a private club for those things or work to make their own fun.

"Otherwise, the taxpayers have to foot the bill and then pay for any damages that may occur to the facility," she said.

Blayney also is concerned that the center could become a hang-out for gangs, or not generate enough interest after its newness wears off.

"I wonder if it would be a novelty and if in time teenagers wouldn't be bored and still feel they have nothing to do," she said.

The issue will be up for discussion at the Rupert Parks and Recreation Department meeting at 7 p.m. June 14 at City Hall.

# Party in the park

## 25,000-plus expected for annual summer kickoff

TWIN FALLS — Western Days is on the fast track toward becoming the mother of all Magic Valley summer festivals.

"I'm amazed," said Sharon Bryan, a deputy Twin Falls city clerk who's the chairwoman of this year's Western Days celebration, which starts its three-day run today. "I've gotten calls from Oregon and Washington wanting to get in our parade. I've received calls from all over the West offering to put our ads in various travel and tourism publications. All over the West, it seems, Western Days is known."

The party drew nearly 25,000 to City Park over a three-day weekend last June, and space — rather than interest — may be the limiting factor.

"The park was just packed last year, and I would expect at least as many this year," Bryan said.

Western Days, now in its 13th year, runs behind the Twin Falls County Fair,

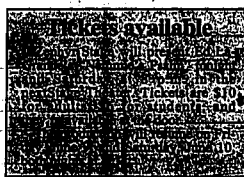
KETCHUM — Playwright Ed LaGrande moved to the mountains for the scenery and the solitude, but New Orleans proved to be a hard habit to shed.

# Pearl Jam, R.E.M. lead summer concert tours

After a record-setting year for concerts, this summer's popular music schedule will seem like a let-down.

The Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Billy Joel and the Eagles — acts that filled thousands of stadium seats last year — are staying home. Those perennial travelers the Grateful Dead are one of the few acts that will try to fill huge arenas this summer.

That's not necessarily bad news to the business-savvy bass player for R.E.M., whose rescheduled tour figures to be one of the year's hottest.

"The less competition, the better," Mike Mills said with a laugh.

Consumers spent a record \$1.4 billion on concerts in summer 1994. Rapidly rising ticket prices helped boost the box office, as did the allure of big acts.

But the cyclical nature of the music business means some of the biggest names are sitting this summer out.

"If artists put albums out every year it would again be a big year," said Jim Koplik, promoter for Metropolitan Entertainment in New York. "But most artists take two or three years. We're in a lean cycle this year."

It came very close to being even leaner.

Pearl Jam, involved in a high-profile war over surcharges with Ticketmaster, cobble together a tour without the cooperation of the nation's leading ticket-selling agent. Pearl Jam is alerting fans about ticket sales through the Internet.

The band wanted to tour last summer, but could not work out the logistics. This year's tour is heavy on West Coast and Midwestern dates.

"They're selling out every date," said Jane Cohen, editor of the trade publication Performance magazine.

The H.O.R.D.E. festival may have its strongest grouping ever, with the Black Crowes, Ziggy Marley and Blues Traveler.

The Budweiser Superfest features Boyz II Men, TLC, Monie Jordan and others. New alternate stars Live and Soul Asylum are both expected to headline package tours of their own.

Many older acts are pairing up to entice nostalgic fans. R.E.O. Speedwagon, Fleetwood Mac and Pat Benatar, Jeff Beck and Santana, Steve Miller and the Doobie Brothers.

Hootic and the Blowfish and the Cranberries are two newer acts that have established themselves as solid draws on the road, according to Gary Bongiovanni, editor of the trade publication Pollstar.

Ringo Starr takes a new All-Starr band on the road, with Felix Cavaliere, Billy Preston and John Entwistle.


Two members of Bruce Springsteen's E Street Band are dropping out of Ringo's tour, fueling speculation that Springsteen may hit the road this fall.



Next week Rod Stewart comes back strong with "A Spanner in the Works" (Warner Bros.), featuring a new Tom Petty number, a tribute to Rod's musical heroes "Muddy, Sam & Otis" and folksy covers of Bob Dylan and Tom Waits songs.

It takes a lot to shake Courtney Love, tough-as-nails survivor-heroine of alternative rock. But that's what happened with the September 1992 issue of Vanity Fair.

"I read a fax of it, and my bones shook," she said later. "I knew that my world was over. I was dead. That was it. The rest of my life. Not only was I going to walk around with a big black mark, but my happiness that I had known, I was going to have to fight for, for the rest of my life."

The article by Lynn Hirschberg suggested that Love took heroin months after she knew she was pregnant with husband Kurt Cobain's child, an allegation Love has vehemently denied.

Eventually, the report led to her child, born healthy on Aug. 18, 1992, being removed from them for a week by the Los Angeles County Department of Children's Services and placed with Courtney's sister for 8 months.

The whole mess reduced the woman of steel to tears. "It's one thing to ruin your credibility or to be publicly humiliated," she sobbed to Michael Azerrad, who wrote a book about Cobain, but they took our baby away, and there was nothing wrong with her."

"It's entirely likely that the title of "Live Through This," Love's latest album with her band Hole, which was completed before Cobain's suicide in April 1994, refers to the "Vanity Fair" story."

One would think the pain caused by the Vanity Fair article would not be entirely forgotten by the young widow and that she would forever avoid the glossy magazine.

That's why it's so shocking to see,

less than three years later, Love adorning the June cover of Vanity Fair, in a lavish Herb Ritsch treatment, formerly reserved only for Madonna — beautifully made up and dressed as an angel, literally stepping out of a gilded frame.

But even Madonna has never given the kind of access afforded writer Kevin Sessums, who usually covers Hollywood starlets. There she is settling into a bath, "her breasts like great cakes of soap, bob about in front of me," Sessums writes. There is news, too, about her breast lift, her dabbling in bisexuality.

Most of all there is the dwelling on the morbidity of Cobain's death. The author sees the ashes. He is allowed to touch the public hair clipped from the corpse. He tromps to the line, oleum floor where the dark deed occurred. And along the way, like a sequel in a horror film, pops up the ghostly image of daughter Frances Bean Cobain — the child Love occurred to keep relatively free from the celebrity glare. Just 2, she's offered up to the maw of the trash-and-flesh subculture by way of a big-eyed Herb Ritsch nude, presented as a kind of harbinger of the new generation. A pretty baby for the children of the damned.

"One would never know that in "The Long Strange Trip of Rock" icon Courtney Love," as the story is subtitled on the cover, Vanity Fair itself had provided so much of the darkest part of that trip.

Drug use or cocaine? — the usual touchstones of any Love portrait — are glossed over quickly. The fact that she had to fight "allegations about (her) using heroin during (her) pregnancy" is mentioned in passing as just another cross she's had to bear — as if the charges did not first appear in the very same magazine.

It seems the computer storage chip implanted in his brain is overloaded, ready to burst. Sadly, his download code went up in smoke after a double-cross. Even worse, Yakuza assassins want to retrieve the data through his scalp.

All poor Johnny wants is to be an empty-headed cyberpunk. Before he can deliver his cargo, however, he has to explore a hostile environment seeking useful electronic equipment and clues, fight for his life against hired killers and occasionally dodge speeding bullet trains.

Imagesoft, \$69.95) is an oasis of innovation in a parched multimedia desert where too many mass-games offer nothing new but packaging.

Here's how it works: When the picture is full screen, the action and dialogue tell the story.

When the image reduces slightly to "letterbox" mode, the player has a window of opportunity to explore, act, or, when challenged, to fight hand-to-hand. A brilliant set of random variables encoded into the program means no two fights are ever

the same, and that different players must devise their own strategies to achieve similar objectives. Controls are mapped on the computer's calculator keypad. Look right, look left. Go forward. Pick up and use something you find. That's about it.

# Look for 'Sunset Boulevard' to dominate this year's Tonys

Even before the ceremonies begin, "Sunset Boulevard" has won major Tony Awards for best music, lyrics and book.

"Sunset" star and Tony-nominee Glenn Close, along with Tony winner Gregory Hines and Nathan Lane, is a host of this year's live awards telecast, which will take place on the Tony-nominated set of "Sunset" at the Minskoff Theatre. CBS carries the event Sunday, June 4.

While it lacks the star power of the Oscar and Emmy telecasts, the Tony Awards broadcast perennially is hailed as the, well, toniest of awards shows, and the award itself is among the most coveted by actors.

Hines knows firsthand what a Tony means to an actor, having looked for an award from both sides. He won the 1992 Tony for best actor in a musical for "Jerry's Last Jam" after three previous nominations. (Coincidentally, he beat Close Lane, who was nominated for "Guys and Dolls").

"You know, for me, it felt very warm to hear my name called out as the winner. I remember that, because the other times it was, like, a harsh sound to hear somebody else's name - like fingernails on a blackboard," Hines remembers with a laugh. "But more than anything, it made my family very happy, my children, my parents, my friends."

"Loosing those other three times, I got over it pretty quick. I lost, (but) about an hour later I got my appetite back every time. I was having a good time at the party and enjoying the experience of having been nominated. But for my friends and family, it was very tough: They wanted me to win... This time I was just so happy to win the thing for everybody else."

While victory was sweet,

Hines says the evening is much more than passing out trophies.

"I'll tell you the truth," he says candidly. "I think awards shows have been blown way out of proportion. I think in our culture we put way too much emphasis on awards. I don't know whether that's because of television, or know that, as an actor, and I've met a lot of actors (who feel this way). It's just a nice little icing on the cake of being able to make our living doing something we enjoy, to be able to express ourselves as artists."

"It's just a nice little thing where we all gather together and have an evening to celebrate some talented people. I think that's what it is, more than anything. It's an evening of community, an evening to spend time with people that we respect and love."

The pre-emptive "Sunset" Tonys are evidence of the most dismal season for new musicals in Broadway history. "Sunset Boule-

vard" literally was the only musical with an original book, music and lyrics to open on Broadway this season (the only other best musical nominee, "Smookey Joe's Cafe: The Songs of Leiber and Stoller," is a bookless revue of rock songs not composed for the stage).

As a result, front-runner Close has only one competitor for best actress in a musical: Rebecca Liles in the revival of "Showboat."

The most likely candidate for best musical actor is Matthew Broderick, a former Tony winner for "Brighton Beach Memoirs," in yet another revival. "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying."

The rising cost of mounting a show on Broadway has led Pulitzer Prize-winning playwrights Neil Simon and Lanford Wilson to announce their future offerings will go off-Broadway. Hines acknowledges the problems, but says, as

with Mark Twain, rumors of Broadway's demise are premature.

"People want to be moved, as they can be moved only by live performance," he says. "I think this is just one of those things that we have to work through. Certainly, it is true that budgets, especially for musicals, are exorbitant. And we live in a time when, a couple of bad reviews and it's over. For me, I've always looked at it from an employment point of view."

"As an African-American artist, there are fewer opportunities. I don't know how many African-American musicals opened this year (there was only one), but I think maybe "Smookey Joe's" is the only one running now."

"My heart doesn't go out to Neil Simon. My heart goes out to my community of African-American theater artists who have to wait for that one or two shows that come to Broadway per year."

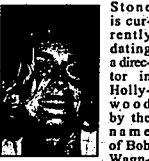

But no storyline is more provocative and important as the current one involving Stone and Robin, the young lovers whose passion for each other comes at a very high price.

It has been revealed only recently that Stone, played by Michael Sutton, was graduated to full-blown AIDS. This, of course, puts Robin, played by Kimberly McCullough, in the high-risk group. Their relationship will be played out over the next few months in "real time" — that is, without accelerating time. The Stone and Robin characters will be seen until the storyline is complete. "That way," says producer Wes Rose, "the audience will be given information about AIDS as the characters themselves learn about the disease and deal with it on a daily basis."

Clair Labine, head writer of "General Hospital," who also picked up a Daytime Emmy, pointed out that the Robin-Stone storyline is a love story first, and that all the newest information in AIDS research will be incorporated into the plot as it progresses.

The two actors playing the young lovers both feel a strong responsibility to viewers, especially the young ones who will be out of school and watching "General Hospital" in large numbers during the summer months. Many teenagers have been given information about AIDS and safe sex through special classes. But when they

become involved with characters close to themselves, such as Robin and Stone, the impact is probably stronger and hopefully the teens will listen more carefully and pay more attention.

Kimberly McCullough admitted that she had to go deeper into herself to play Robin. She also hopes over the next few months to learn "Apart from the important issue we're portraying, I personally feel challenged as an actress by the storyline. I think the writing is absolutely perfect and working with Michael is ideal."

Sutton confessed that he was a bit overwhelmed at first when he was told about the plans to have his character contract AIDS. But he also realizes that this was a chance to do some very fine material. He also felt the same enormous responsibility facing everyone to get the story right and not only be informative but dramatically sound at the same time.

In an innovative move, ABC Daytime Press will publish "Robin's Diary," which will be similar to the diary the young characters keep on the show that chronicles her love for Stone from beginning to end. The paperback will be released at a date to be announced and the profits will go to AIDS research.

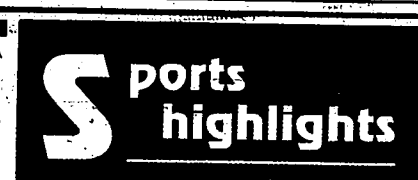

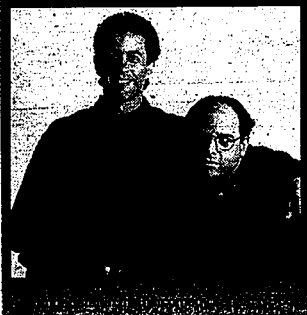
