U.S., Japan to drive for auto deal

HALIFAX, Nova Scotia — President Clinton and Japanese Prime Minister Tomiichi Murayama said Thursday they would ask their trade negotiators to step up efforts at reaching an agreement on their tense auto trade dispute before \$5.9 billion in U.S. sanctions are applied on Japanese exports of luxury cars.
The two are attending the Group of Seven economic summit here through June 16. A deadline of June 23 looms, and officials from both countries have made clear that the gap between the two sides remains formidable. However, the two leaders in-

structed their aides to find a compromise when negotiators from the two countries meet in Geneva June 22-23.
Failure to reach an agreement would result not only in the application of the \$5.9 billion in sanctions, but also in both countries filing dispute settlement suits at the World Trade Organization. The Japanese case would be filed to protest the issuance of U.S. sanctions, while the U.S. action is aimed at breaking down the non-tariff barriers to imports from the Japanese automotive market.
"I have instructed our negotiators to pursue every possible avenue of resolution before the June 23 deadline. And I remain

hopeful that an acceptable, meaningful agreement can be reached. But if a solution cannot be found by that deadline, I will impose sanctions and the United States will also pursue a case before the World Trade Organization," the president told reporters.
The two leaders said they did not engage in specific negotiations during their meeting ahead of the summit.
Clinton said the strong relations between the two countries in the areas of environmental cooperation, nuclear nonproliferation and the fight against international terrorism insured that the trade dispute would not totally undermine relations between

the two countries.
The relationship, he said, constituted "the most important force for peace in the Asia-Pacific."
Officials said the instructions from Clinton and Murayama did not indicate a softening of either side's position but reflected both sides' desire to settle the matter before sanctions are applied.
U.S. officials made clear that no extension of the deadline was possible. One official said Secretary of State Warren Christopher told his Japanese counterpart Yoshi Kono Thursday that Washington considered the June 23 to be "a deadline, and not a goal or a target."

Downtown merchant fights parking meters

TWIN FALLS — It's mid-afternoon as Jim Peterson, one of the city's two full-time parking enforcement officials, plops north along Main Avenue, pausing every few feet to glance at the parking meters.
Peterson knows not to pass by 245 Main Ave. W.

There, he stops in front of Dan Dane's mint green Chevy truck and checks his hand-held computer. Within seconds, the machine spits out a ticket, which Peterson slides under the pickup's windshield wiper.

"We get him pretty near every day," Peterson said Thursday as he issued Dane a \$10 ticket.

But Dane, standing a few feet away, doesn't seem to be worried that he has racked up more than \$400 in parking tickets in the past year. He is more concerned about what will happen this morning when he goes up against the Business Improvement District in small claims court.

The BID, which took over control of downtown parking in May 1994, also is trying to track down \$267 in unpaid tabs from shopkeeper Diane Arambula and \$122 from Victor Zalesky of Twin Falls.
"People don't take downtown parking seriously," said Jennie Wilson, the BID's executive director.

Wilson said an average of 14 motorists with previous parking-meter violations are caught each month with their cars parked in front of meters that read "Time Expired."

Even attorney Mike Wood, Twin Falls County's public defender, left his car parked illegally on Main Avenue Thursday afternoon as he stopped by Dane's fly-fishing shop to offer last-minute legal advice.

Still, Wilson said parking enforcement is "a lot better than it was" a year ago. Under city control, meters were checked sporadically by a part-time employee. The BID checks meters full-time Mondays through Fridays. Motorists can park for free on weekends, and for two hours in any of the lots behind Main Avenue merchants, Wilson said.

Wilson said the district has a new parking guide in the works that will be distributed to downtown merchants and the workers again in the fall.
"People ask me on a daily basis, 'Why don't you get rid of the meters?'" Wilson said.

Money collected from the meters — between \$1,800 and \$2,000 in a typical month — goes back into downtown improvements, she said.

Plus, if the meters were taken out, she said some of the 2,000 people who work downtown would park in spots that should be saved for customers. Employees should be parking in the leased lots that are scattered throughout downtown, she said.

Dane said he understands that Main Avenue spots should be open to customers, but that doesn't solve his parking dilemma. He said he can't find a space to lease anywhere near his store.

"I choose to park in front of my busi-

ness because I don't want to park in front of someone else's business," he said.

Wilson acknowledged that almost all of the leased spaces are filled. She said new spaces might be found along the 200 block of Second Avenue West where an old linen building was demolished earlier this month.

The district isn't looking to anger merchants or scare away potential customers by checking the meters, she said. Each month, she said, the district hands out more than 1,000 "grit" tickets that serve as friendly warnings.

"We don't give out many tickets," she said. "Except to people like Dane."

Dane said he has pretty good case against the BID, Wilson isn't sure.

But the BID had the city's parking regulations amended Monday anyway, in part to straighten out some outdated measures that might help Dane's case. The new regulations also beef up fines for repeat offenders. While a first violation still only gets a warning, the fines spiral up from \$1 up to \$100 for an unpaid fifth offense in a month.

Wilson said she thinks the new regulations will do much to help crack down on illegal parking.

Dane's case will be heard at 9 a.m. today in Twin Falls small claims court before Magistrate Kevin P. Cassidy.

Militia leaders tell Senate they're not violent

WASHINGTON — Facing a skeptical panel of the U.S. Senate, five militia leaders portrayed themselves Thursday as ordinary, patriotic Americans who just happen to be burdened with a terrible knowledge: "Lesbians" and "sex perverts" run the FBI and the IRS. The U.S. military is building "civilian prison camps" on Army bases. And the United Nations is manipulating our weather.

"I know that seems kind of like Space Rangers kind of talk," said Bob Fletcher, a former puppet maker and a founder of the Militia of Montana. "Unfortunately, we've got all the proof."

Their testimony came during a meeting of the Senate Judiciary Committee panel convened the hearing "to examine the militia movement" and determine whether they pose a threat to public safety in the wake of the April 19 bombing of an Oklahoma City federal building.

The only suspect in custody, Timothy McVeigh and Terry Nichols reportedly associated with members of the Michigan Militia.

The five militia members from Michigan, Iowa, and Ohio, four wearing camouflage uniforms, and their bear to attack the Senate's hearing.

"We are certainly totally against vio-

lence ... We do not believe in hatred; we do not believe in racism," said Ken Adams, a marketing consultant and a member of the Michigan Militia. "We are law-abiding, God-fearing Americans ... who are very, very concerned with what's going on in our country."
"What is going on in our country," according to the militiamen?

For one thing, the Japanese set off the bomb that killed 168 people in Oklahoma City, according to Norm Olson, a Baptist minister and the former commander of the Michigan Militia. They did it because we passed their subways, he said.

Olson, who wore his omnipresent militia hat, said the outfit on duty in the vast Capitol Hill hearing room was voted out of the militia leadership in part for this unorthodox reasoning.

There's also the weather tampering equipment the United States has to switch electrical charges to the sphere and damage American crops, he said.

That idea seemed to strike Sen. Herbert Kohl, D-Wis., as a little far-fetched.

"You're saying the government has created weather tampering techniques to the New World Order," will be able to starve millions of Americans and control the world," Kohl asked.

"That's my belief," Fletcher responded. "If you think that 85 tornadoes take place in the middle of our growing area by simultaneous accident — I'm sorry, as bizarre as that is, it is proven and docu-

mented."
But the most important issue for the militia is a growing tyranny in Washington that threatens to enslave the people and take their guns, among other things.

"Some of the legislation coming out of Washington, these are the things that got the Revolution started 200 years ago," said James Johnson, a utility company employee and a leader in the Ohio Unorganized Militia.

"What the militia is, it's a mindset. It's the civil rights issue of the '90s," Johnson said.

"We're not baby killers; we're baby boomers ... We're not extremists; we're just extremely ticked off."

Other witnesses, however, were inclined to disagree. Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich., described how militiamen in Michigan have been caught "stalking" employees of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms.

A panel of five law officers, including witnesses from the FBI and the ATF, noted that civil rights groups have estimated that

Simpson slips on bloody gloves for jury

LOS ANGELES (AP) — With jurors watching wide-eyed, O.J. Simpson struggled Thursday to shove his hands into the bloody leather gloves that prosecutors say implicate him in two murders. "They're too small," the defendant declared.

The demonstration provided perhaps the most dramatic moment in Simpson's trial and appeared to backfire on the prosecutor who requested it. Simpson grimaced and raised his eyebrows as he tried to pull the distinctive Aris Leather Eight gloves over a pair of latex gloves he had to wear to protect the evidence. Even the stretchy latex gloves seemed to give the former football star problems. Deputy District Attorney Christo-

pher Darden tried to suggest to jurors that Simpson, an actor, was faking his struggle. Once Simpson had the gloves on as far as they could go, the prosecutor asked that he grip an object, a marking pen, to show he could bend his hands. Simpson obliged over objections from defense attorney Johnnie Cochran Jr., grasping the marker in his right fist and holding it up.

Telecom changes win Senate passage

WASHINGTON — Legislation making enormous changes in the nation's telecommunications laws, with far-reaching implications for every American who watches television or talks on the telephone, was approved by the Senate Thursday.

The bill, approved by a vote of 81-18, would let telephone, long-distance and cable companies get into each other's businesses and free the largest electric utilities to provide an array of telecommunications services.

The bill would deregulate cable rates and would impose the most sweeping provisions ever to ban smut on computer services. It would also open people a powerful technological tool to stop violent and other objectionable programs from appearing on their television screens.

The measure would lift longstanding limits on how many TV and radio stations one company may own and would remove an 83-year-old restriction on foreign ownership of telecommunications companies as long other countries remove theirs.

Republicans target abortion rights

WASHINGTON — Republicans zeroed in on abortion rights Thursday, leading a House vote to impose a ban on such operations at overseas military hospitals and pushing a bill that could jail doctors who perform them late in pregnancy.

House lawmakers defeated, 230-196, a Democratic amendment that would have kept abortions legal at the military hospitals. The ban, which President Clinton had lifted by executive order in early 1993, would be reinstated as part of a 1996 defense spending plan the House approved later Thursday. Ten abortions have been performed at those hospitals since Clinton issued the order.

While the defense bill was on the House floor, lawmakers in the House Judiciary subcommittee took up a Republican bill that would subject doctors who perform "partial-birth abortions" to fines, up to two years' imprisonment, or both.

3 conservatives quit Dem panel

WASHINGTON — In the latest discord to surface among minority Democrats, four conservative law-

makers have resigned from the party's campaign committee in the House.

"They said it was intolerant of differing views on clean-water legislation and other measures."

"Such tactics assure only one outcome, a minority status," the four wrote Rep. Martin Frost, the Texan who heads the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee. Signing the letters were Rep. Mike Parker of Mississippi, Jimmy Hayes and W.J. (Billy) Tauzin of Louisiana, and Greg Laughlin of Texas.

Rebel gunmen threaten hostages

MOSCOW — Chechen rebel sympathizers holding hundreds of civilian hostages battled troops in a southern Russian city Thursday, spreading the carnage of war beyond Chechnya's borders and sparking terror alerts as far away as Moscow.

The Interior Ministry said 42 people died and dozens were wounded in running gun battles when as many as 200 men believed to be Chechen rebels stormed the city of Budyonovsk on Wednesday.

Thousands of Russian soldiers and police poured into the city some 90 miles north of Chechnya to try to restore order. But clashes reportedly continued Thursday between snipers and security forces, and the hostage situation remained in flux.

Government troops bombard Serbs

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina (AP) — The Bosnian army loosed infantry and artillery onslaughts Thursday on Serb forces ringing Sarajevo, building toward a high-stakes attempt to punch through the Serb stranglehold that has nearly exhausted the Bosnian capital.

While the attacks took place north of Sarajevo, an area where 15,000 Bosnian soldiers are massed, army sources described them as preliminary and said the threatened offensive had not yet been launched. The Serbs, however, did not wait to see if the Bosnians were bluffing and used bulldozers to call up reservists. In Sarajevo, the streets were nearly empty as the Bosnian army and people braced for what the United Nations fears will be a major escalation of the conflict.

Legislators propose dropping fraudulent firms from Medicare

WASHINGTON (AP) — Lawmakers accused the government Thursday of being too lenient with crooks caught ripping off Medicare and Medicaid, often letting them continue doing business with the health insurance programs for the elderly, disabled and poor.

"The chances of getting caught are small. Penalties are mild," said Rep. Christopher Shays, R-Conn., chairman of a House Government Reform and Oversight subcommittee. "Even when a wrongdoer is caught, the government often settles the case for monetary fines and nominal restitution."

Setting off the criticism was Bruce C. Vladeck, chief of the Health Care Financing Administration, who told a congressional hearing that he didn't think his agency needed more power to exclude unscrupulous physicians, laboratories and other medical suppliers.

Vladeck said he was just "an observer" in the process by which federal investigators and prosecutors cut deals with some guilty health care providers and let them pay fines but keep billing Medicare and Medicaid.

That prompted Shays to accuse the Medicare chief of passing the buck: "I feel like somehow you're a janitor watching what's happening in this program and not the person in charge."

Congressional auditors have estimated that 10 cents from every health care dollar is lost to fraud and abuse. Shays said Medicare and Medicaid may be losing \$26 billion a year, \$71 million a day. Billions could be saved each year if fraudulent providers were more readily excluded from the programs, he said.

Rep. William F. Clinger, Jr., R-Pa., chairman of the full committee,

said, "When the Health Care Financing Administration and the Department of Justice do catch somebody, they ought to kick them out of the program permanently."

June Gibbs Brown, the inspector general of the Department of Health and Human Services, said that since 1984, the government has excluded 7,795 individuals and 788 health care entities from Medicare and state health care programs. Some 1,335 were later reinstated.

Vladeck said the Clinton administration soon will send Congress legislation that would strengthen the government's hand in fighting fraud by creating a revolving fund from fines and recoveries to pay for further investigations.

But he said the administration would not ask for changes in the law to make it easier to kick providers out of Medicare and Medicaid and to keep them out.

House passes spending hike for military

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House passed the first real military spending increase in a decade Thursday, approving a \$267 billion plan that would add money for troop readiness, B-2 bombers and a host of other defense programs.

The defense budget plan for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1, passed 300-126, is \$4 billion more than the current year's authorization and \$9.5 billion more than President Clinton and the Senate sought to spend. Those differences remain to be resolved.

"For the first time in a decade, the defense authorization bill says stop," said Rep. Floyd Spence, R-S.C., chairman of the House National Security Committee. "Stop the slide in defense spending. Stop the dissipation of our military power on futile missions. Stop the postponing of proper training. Stop the decline of our defense industrial base. Stop the erosion of servicemembers' quality of life."

Although previous budgets have increased in dollar amounts, the hikes were not large enough to offset rises in inflation.

"The mark of the Republican majority is visible throughout the bill. On defense matters, it would pump billions more into weapons purchases. In addition to the B-2, it includes money for a third Navy destroyer, two transport ships, a dozen fighter planes, and a national missile defense system, none of which were requested by the Pentagon.

On relations with Russia, the measure would freeze aid to help former Soviet States dismantle their nuclear arsenals until Moscow ends its biological weapons program. It also contains language that could clear the way for violating the Antiballistic Missile Treaty.

"On social issues, the bill would ban abortions at overseas military hospitals and requires the automatic discharge of service members who test positive for the AIDS virus.

Critics of the bill say it reverts to a Cold War mentality at a time when threats to the United States have diminished and domestic programs to aid the needy are being slashed.

Pilot who drops toilet paper earns jail time

INDEPENDENCE, Kan. (AP) — A pilot got 60 days in jail for bombing Main Street from his small plane with rolls of toilet paper.

Robert Moore, 38, of Dallas, dropped several rolls last fall.

The pipeline patrol pilot was convicted last month of littering and refusing to take a breath test. Judge

Russell Canaday sentenced him to the maximum.

Sheriff Jack Daniels said Moore had been drinking with friends and bragged he could hit Main Street from the air.

Moore bought a four-roll package and set off in his rented plane. He missed his target.

Wilson to pull a Perot and announce candidacy on Larry King show

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — Gov. Pete Wilson will announce next Thursday on the Larry King show that he will seek the Republican presidential nomination.

Wilson told supporters Thursday morning that he will definitely enter the 1996 race for the White House.

"There have been a lot of rumors to the contrary put out by people engaged in wishful thinking," Wilson said in a telephone conference call.

Wilson's slow recovery from April 14 throat surgery, plus incense support

in polls and slower-than-expected fund-raising, have raised speculation that the Republican might not seek the White House.

Wilson, whose voice is still weak from surgery, plans a campaign trip through Florida this weekend, Walsh said. He is scheduled to appear on CNN's "Larry King Live" next Thursday, his campaign said.

Drug culture changes face in West

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — For the longest time, Gary Burton's family looked just about ideal.

Burton's journal charted the daily events of a proud family man: "Suzy's baseball team won district... Shelly won cheerleader. Those Burton girls are the best... Gave Clint my favorite T-shirt today for his first football jersey..."

Clinton Burton was in middle school when his father brought something new into the family home in the rural, southern Oregon town of Eagle Point.

Methamphetamine changed everything.

"The diary entries cut off when he started using meth. He didn't keep a diary after that point," says attorney Charles Kochlacs.

Methamphetamine, a homebrewed concoction known as crank or speed among users, is becoming the drug of choice in much of the West. With roots in California, the drug has quickly spread into Oregon, Washington and Arizona, says John Coonce, the Drug Enforcement Agency's supervisory special agent.

Police report increased methamphetamine use in groups ranging from curious teen-agers and weight-conscious housewives to hardened addicts, says Steve Evans, state coordinator for the Western States Information Network, which collects law enforcement data.

Meth is a mix of ephedrine, a naturally occurring drug used to treat asthma and snuffy noses, with other chemicals readily available in gasoline, rubbing alcohol, pool-cleaning supplies or drain cleaners. It can be snorted, smoked or injected. Coonce says it is in the '90s what cocaine was to the '80s. But meth is cheaper than cocaine, more readily available and longer-lasting.

"With meth, you're more awake than with cocaine," says one 37-year-old user in San Diego. He's the father of a teen-age girl and used to manage a restaurant. "Cocaine — it gives you a little rush and then you go down. But with this, you stay the same. You can stay awake for days and days."

The drug's euphoric high is followed by deep depression and paranoia. Long-term users often leap into violent rages.

"The people, by the time we got to them, are usually in the criminal justice system or on welfare. They don't stay employed long once they get hooked on that stuff," says Lane County sheriff's detective Scott Barnes, a member of the Valley Interagency Narcotics Team in Albany, Ore. "Basically, it's a poor man's cocaine."

Gary Burton started buying large quantities of methamphetamine in 1989, by Kochlacs' account — for his own use and to sell to others: his wife, Regina, began using it, and 13-year-old Clinton was pressured to take it so he could work long hours in his father's auto repair shop.

"As Burton demanded his son work harder and harder, arguments erupted every day. Eventually, the parents simply refused to drive the boy to the bus stop 7 miles away, insisting Clint work in the shop rather than attend school. He had no other way to Eagle Point High."

"He was trapped on the property. He was left alone to deal with his father's ranting, raving and abuse," Kochlacs says. "It was an atmosphere of terror. His dad was completely unpredictable, violently angry."

"The mother would leave, sometimes hiding in the fields, and Clint would be the one there dealing with the father."

With older sisters Suzanne, 24, and Shelly, 20, already out of the nest, Clint decided he had to escape. The

arty — has become a distribution hub for methamphetamine flowing north from California, Mayer said.

The county's drug team spends two-thirds of its time on methamphetamine cases. In 1991, law officers filed 81 charges of meth possession, distribution or manufacture. The number jumped to 177 in 1992, to 343 in 1993. Last year, it was 812. County investigators who saw 6 ounces of the drug in 1991 seized more than 10 pounds in 1994.

Further up Interstate 5, Salem police seized 27 pounds of methamphetamine from January through April 30. About 12 pounds were taken in all of 1994; in each of the previous three years, levels were below 5 pounds.

In contrast, cocaine seizures dropped from 46 pounds in 1991 to 7 pounds last year.

"We're talking major increases," said police Cpl. Tim Dieder, a member of the Salem Area Interagency Narcotics Team. "In the eight years I've worked narcotics, I've seen more in the last year than in the past seven years."

Gary and Clint were shouting from separate rooms when the boy fired a 22-caliber pistol through a closed bedroom door.

She rushed back and found Clint desperately trying to save his 44-year-old father. Burton died before medics could reach the home.

Clint is now serving a three-month jail sentence in a residential drug treatment center concurrent with a year-long stay there. That will be followed by five years' probation. He declined to be interviewed.

"Clinton basically became an addict at his father's direction," says Kochlacs, a public defender who represented Clinton at trial.

"Methamphetamine led to the demise of the family," said sheriff's Lt. Ed Mayer, commander of the Jackson County Narcotics Enforcement Team. "That family started out as a very typical family with strong family values. Meth led to the eventual tragic results of what occurred."

Group seeks ban on lice drug

WASHINGTON (AP) — A prescription drug for lice should be banned because it can cause potentially fatal neurological damage, a consumer group asserted Thursday.

The drug, lindane, is an insecticide on which the Environmental Protection Agency imposes strong restrictions. Less-potent versions are sold as creams and shampoos to be rubbed into the scalp and skin to treat lice and scabies, a similar parasitic infection.

The World Health Organization recommends against using lindane for lice and scabies, and two leading manufacturers voluntarily pulled their products from U.S. shelves in recent years, said Dr. Sidney Wolfe of the consumer group Public Citizen.

But the Food and Drug Administration allows the sale of at least 11 products containing lindane to continue, totaling just 2 million prescriptions for the drug in 1992, he said.

Perot praises Clinton's moves

WASHINGTON (AP) — Ross Perot praised President Clinton for his balanced budget plan Thursday and said "positive, aggressive things" are happening in Washington.

But he wouldn't rule out running for president again in 1996. Perot, who ran as an independent in 1992, said he would not enter either Republican or Democratic primaries. But he also said polls suggest Americans would like to see a third major party organized.

On the budget, Perot declined to say whether he preferred Clinton's new budget plan or the proposals of congressional Republicans who would restrain spending more vigorously.

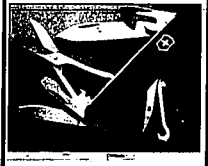

Quake kills 15 in Greece

EGION, Greece (AP) — Rescue teams with trained dogs sifted through the rubble and workers set up temporary housing Thursday after an early morning earthquake killed 15 people and left hundreds of others homeless. The 3:15 a.m. quake toppled walls and buildings as residents slept in this southwestern port town.

The bodies of nine Greeks were pulled out of an apartment building that police said collapsed like "a house of cards," while five French tourists died when a wing of the Eliki hotel collapsed.

An Italian woman was killed in the earthquake. Seven other French tourists were missing in the hotel's rubble and four British, while eight Greeks in the apartment building were missing as well.

At least 59 people were hospitalized with serious injuries, and dozens of others received emergency treatment before being released, the public works ministry reported.

Authorities declared about 500 buildings uninhabitable because of cracks and collapsed walls, and set up about 200 tents to house the homeless.

Hotel night watchman Yannis Bougas said he pulled two dead French visitors from the debris.

"There was a loud noise and the whole world turned to dust," Bougas said, his shirt stained with blood. "I came out and saw part of the hotel had collapsed and ran to the area and started shouting to the French to get out, and those who could get out."

Train crash injures 60

HANOVER, Germany (AP) — Two local trains collided head-on near a station in the northern German town of Schneverdingen Thursday, injuring about 60 people, including 30 seriously, police said.

The two trains, carrying over 200 people, collided on a stretch of single track where one train is supposed to wait on a siding for the other to pass.

Police investigating why the northbound train was not on the siding when the southbound train came along said an electronic device designed to prevent such crashes failed to function.

Coup attempt against Saddam crushed

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — An attempted coup against Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein was crushed Thursday after government tanks and helicopters battled the rebels at an army camp near Baghdad, diplomatic sources said.

The coup was led by an army brigade that tried to take over a broadcast station at Abu Ghraib, 12 miles

east of the capital, to announce an anti-Saddam government in hopes of gaining wide support, according to diplomats based in the Persian Gulf. Iraqi opposition figures in England, Iran and Syria also reported the coup attempt in the town, which contains an army base and prison. They claimed the fighting started Wednesday and was still raging Thursday.

But the diplomatic sources said the coup was crushed by two other brigades from the Abu Ghraib base and its leader, an army brigadier, committed suicide. The source spoke on condition of anonymity.

Iraq denied there had been any fighting, saying the reports were spread by its enemies in oil-rich Persian Gulf states.

Iraq denies it will meet with Kuwait on missing

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) — Iraq denied Thursday that it will meet with Kuwaiti officials later this month to discuss 600 Kuwaitis believed held in Iraq since the 1991 Gulf War.

Kuwait's foreign minister said earlier this week that the meeting, involving officials from Kuwait, Iraq and the International Committee of the Red Cross, would take place in late June.

Improving school building is still a call for the locals

This week's election results in Hagerman demonstrate the precariousness of school-construction funding in Idaho.

Just last month, districts all around the state were celebrating their success in winning voters' approval for tax measures. Gov. Phil Batt's tax-relief package was regarded as a partial explanation for the voters' good mood.

But on Tuesday, Hagerman's proposal for a new high school fell to a crushing defeat — even though the building was 75 years old and was considered beyond repair.

To find out why the bond issue failed, you'd have to ask the 283 people (out of 512) who voted no. But we can offer this universal explanation: Proposals lose when communities lack a consensus for new construction.

Unfortunately, that's just a fancy way of saying, "A lot of people voted no." But it underscores the basic problem that bedevils lots of school districts — and which keeps many students studying in dilapidated schools.

Earlier this week, a front-page article explored the inadequacies of many Magic Valley school buildings. Kids in many of the valley's smaller districts are being schooled in ramshackle buildings that may be dangerous. Some of them stay open solely because inspectors are willing to look the other way.

This situation persists because construction costs fall squarely on local property owners, who often are reluctant to indenture themselves to long-term construction bonds. The state provides no meaningful aid; lottery revenue was supposed to help, but it may actually hurt. (Though there's not enough of it to make a difference, some voters regard its existence as an excuse to vote no on local taxes.)

Since 1993, when a study commission identified Idaho school buildings as a \$700 million problem, lots of ideas have been tossed around for helping local districts. Generally, these ideas involve a state contribution, which means higher state taxes, which means the Legislature won't adopt them.

That leaves local districts back where they started — relying on the goodwill of local voters. But that reliance is not altogether a bad thing.

Bond issues are one way voters can still influence the direction of local education. Construction decisions some-

times crystalize the key issues about the future of local schools. Will a small district retain its independence, or will it try to economize by sharing resources with a neighboring district? Will it offer students a bare-bones program, or will its facilities allow advanced science and technology courses?

To settle issues of this type, local school officials must engage their communities in a focused dialogue. They must combine listening with persuading, in order to build a consensus for action.

It's not an easy task. Witness Hagerman's defeat last week. Witness the agony of Murtaugh, which debated construction vs. consolidation for years, until a bond issue finally passed last month.

The difficulty of passing a bond issue is, in a way, insurance against inefficiently considered construction plans. Perhaps it is too difficult; perhaps some state help is needed.

But this much is clear: Idaho's two-thirds approval requirement for bond issues is still a sound idea. It saves taxpayers money and it forces local school districts to run a tight ship.

More fundamentally, it makes both local schools and the communities they serve accountable. If the plaster is falling off the ceiling at Central High, there's nobody to blame but the taxpayers who own the school.

There are some alternatives that the Legislature might explore. Superintendent of Public Instruction Anne Fox's proposal for a penny increase in the state's sales tax to help school districts pay for bricks and mortar merits consideration.

So does the notion of a local-option sales tax that local school officials could use if they could talk a majority of local voters into it. Legislators have so steadfastly refused to approve a broad-based local-option tax plan; maybe it's time they changed their minds.

In the meantime, school officials must keep plugging away — telling the community what they need and listening to what the community wants. And voters, for their part, need to think hard about the value of decent educational facilities to a community's future — as well as the cost of shortchanging our youth.

Limiting damages helps society, hurts lawyers

Bipartisan legal reform is moving with great momentum through Congress.

The House and Senate have passed product liability bills and are now moving to conference to resolve the differences, while further legal reform measures are getting serious consideration in House and Senate committees.

Much of this legislation is controversial. But one measure, a separate bill being proposed by Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, should spark no controversy at all, because it's hard to make any kind of case against it.

The Hatch bill would prohibit the awarding of multiple punitive damages — that is, repeatedly punishing a defendant for essentially a single act in the past.

The purpose of awarding punitive damages is to punish and deter future egregious behavior. While five states prohibit any award of punitive damages, many observers believe that under certain limited conditions, granting punitive damages can have merit if there is a reasonable standard to define the conditions warranting their award and an appropriate cap on the amount.

But under current law, and even in the current bill before the House-Senate conference, punitive damages can be awarded over and over again to different plaintiffs against the same defendant for essentially the same act or course of conduct.

For example, Company A commits an act and is found liable. Compensation for actual or perceived injury is awarded to the plaintiff. In addition, significant, punitive damages are awarded against the company to deter future bad behavior.

It defies logic, then, that after the punitive damages are awarded, the company still has to pay punitive damages to future plaintiffs for the same past activity. The result is unfair and excessive punishment.

The American Trial Lawyers Association (ATLA) cites statistics from a study that says

punitive damages are not awarded often, and are frequently reduced or overturned on appeal. However, that same study also notes, "The actual number of punitive damages awards in product liability litigation is unknown and possibly unknowable because no comprehensive reporting system exists."

At the same time, studies in several other states show that the number of multiple punitive damages cases is, in fact, increasing dramatically.

Academic studies and incomplete court data so far have failed to reflect the real world of product liability — buried in the frequent and huge private settlements driven by well-orchestrated threats of multiple punitive damages.

The practice often involves lawyers amassing numbers of similar cases and continuing to bring them to trial until one or more juries finally assigns punitive damages. Then, under the threat of a flood of future punitive awards, the settlement talks begin.

A recent survey that I conducted among large American firms is instructive. In 1995 this representative group of 43 corporations — the deep-pocket targets of trial lawyers — reported that in the past five years a total of \$4.4 billion was involved in private settlements driven by punitive damages.

Extrapolate that the growing number of companies, large and small, involved as defendants in punitive damages cases, and you get some idea of the scope of the problem.

The private settlements do not show up in the statistics cited by the trial lawyers' group on the "inefficiency" of actual punitive damage payments. There is no tally in these studies of the huge settlements caused by the prospect — indeed, in some cases, the likelihood — of multiple punitive damages. That's because settlement amounts and conditions are under-

standably kept confidential in the settlement agreement in order to ward off a feeding frenzy by circling plaintiff attorneys.

The real damage caused by multiple punitive damages is that the American public has been hit with a "hidden litigation tax." The costs of the multiple punitive damages lottery are passed on to consumers in the form of higher prices, or unavailability of useful products.

The costs even take the form of reduced security for retirees. With more than 50 percent of stocks owned directly or indirectly by retirees or those near retirement, depreciated stock values are not just a "fat-cat" concern.

The victims may not be faceless out-of-state corporations, as lawyers so often put it to jurors, but real hometown people.

Appropriate legislation would state that punitive damages can be awarded only once, unless subsequent facts in new cases are substantially different, with a careful definition of "different."

Judges would also be empowered to permit punitive damages a second time if the first award was held to be an "insufficient deterrent." The first award would then be subtracted from the larger second award. In order to avoid a "rush to the courthouse" by lawyers, the legislation should apply to all civil actions in which the trial has not commenced before the effective date of the act.

That's it. In no other instances would punitive damages be awarded multiple times essentially the same event.

Under the Hatch bill, injured parties would still retain full rights to compensation for injury. The public's pocketbook would be protected, and product suppliers would get fair treatment. The only losers would be the trial lawyers.

If a parolee is ordered to take a urinalysis, he or she has up to two hours to perform; otherwise, it is considered a refusal. They only gave me 25 to 30 minutes. In that amount of time, I found it impossible to deliver them a specimen.

At this time, they decided to treat it as a refusal and booked me. Bail was set at \$685. I am not even on probation. The following morning, I was arraigned in Judge Brumbaugh's court. He proceeded to raise my bond to \$2,500. Why? This is my first time on this type of charge. I am not a menace to society. How am I to provide for my two children? I don't have the money to bond out. My employer has let me go for failure to show up. My next court date is Aug. 27. So, in essence, I have to spend 110

McRoberts takes Welfare post

TWIN FALLS — State Sen. Joyce McRoberts, R-Twin Falls, is leaving the Legislature to take a job with the Department of Health and Welfare.

McRoberts, 53, will serve as Magic Valley regional director for the department, a post that pays \$57,000 a year.

The four-term lawmaker informed local GOP leaders Wednesday she is resigning, effective July 29. McRoberts begins her new job on Aug. 1. She is the eighth Idaho Republican this year to trade a seat in the Legislature for a position in the administration of Gov. Phil Batt.

Health and Welfare Director Linda Caballero noted McRoberts' experience on the Senate Health and Welfare Committee

and the Special Legislative Committee on Health Care, predicting McRoberts will excel in her new position.

"Joyce McRoberts brings to the department extensive experience with health and human service issues," Caballero said. "Over the years, she has demonstrated keen understanding of issues affecting the department and compassion for the people we serve."

Thursday, McRoberts said she is excited about her new job, but proud of her Statehouse service. "I think I've done a lot

Maybe not things that showed, but being in leadership and changing the way we do business to be more efficient," she said. As a senator, McRoberts worked on juvenile justice, health care, and other issues. She also worked to get state funding for road projects in her district such as the Clear Lake grade.

McRoberts says she was a moderating force in the Senate, while serving as majority leader and as a committee chairman. State Sen. Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, agrees. "I thought she was a constantly stabilizing factor in the state Senate, always willing to assume responsibility and devoting a great deal of time and effort to the job," he said.

As a Health and Welfare regional director, McRoberts said she'll work to improve conditions for local residents and working conditions for Health and Welfare employ-

ees. "They have a lot of pressures and I'm sure they feel overburdened at times. My job will be to find ways to ease those burdens and make things easier for them so they can in turn better serve the citizens of this community," McRoberts said.

The outgoing senator hadn't endorsed a successor and so far, there aren't any declared candidates. But two local Republicans, Twin Falls County GOP Central Committee Chairman Gary Grindstaff and Twin Falls farmer Gerald Tews are thinking about seeking McRoberts' Statehouse seat.

Within 10 days of McRoberts' July 29 departure, the District 22 Republican Legislative Committee will choose three nominees and send their names to Batt. The governor will then choose McRoberts' successor.

Weather helps to reduce Big Wood flood threat

HAILEY — As the weather begins to cool, so is the threat of flooding on the Big Wood River, the National Weather Service has reported.

The river is expected to reach 5.1 feet at Hailey today and drop below 5 feet sometime tonight. Flood watch is at 5 feet, while flood stage is at 6 feet.

The Big Wood should continue to drop slowly on Saturday and Sunday, the weather service reported. Lower air temperatures are expected to retard the rate of snowmelt, thus lowering the river.

On Thursday, the river crested at 5.4 feet — but it was beginning to recede by early evening.

Twin Falls man admits to molesting 4 Boise girls

BOISE — A Twin Falls man admitted to a judge Tuesday that he molested four Boise girls last year — in exchange, a prosecutor dropped three of four sexual abuse charges against him.

Theodore Gene Johnson, in his mid-60s, will be sentenced for felony lewd conduct in July, said Ada County Deputy Prosecutor Jean Fisher.

Johnson molested four girls last year while visiting Boise, Fisher said. A Boise grand jury indicted Johnson in January. Tuesday, as part of his plea bargain, Johnson pleaded guilty to lewd conduct with a pre-teen girl. He also had to admit molesting his three other victims for purposes of sentencing," Fisher said.

Fisher plans to recommend that Johnson spend six months at the Northern Idaho Correctional Institution in Cottonwood for a psychological examination. After the evaluation, Fisher can ask that he spend at least five years in prison, regardless if he is treatable and remorseful of his crimes, she said.

Johnson posted a \$10,000 bond from jail soon after his arrest last year, she said. Fourth District Judge Daniel Eismann will sentence Johnson next month, she said.

Owyhee officials back sheriff versus BLM

MURPHY — Owyhee County commissioners stand behind Sheriff Tim Nettleton's call for stripping federal law enforcement of their "peace officer" status within their borders.

But many other county sheriffs around the state say they need all the law-enforcement help they can get.

Owyhee commissioners Dick Bass, Hal Tolmie and Chet Sellman on Monday agreed to back up Nettleton in case of a lawsuit over rescinding the U.S. Bureau of Land Management's clout in the county.

The county fears almost anything could happen, from BLM officers disregarding Nettleton's authority to the U.S. attorney general's office filing a lawsuit.

The BLM manages the eastern reaches of the county out of its Twin Falls offices. The state BLM director has announced that Nettleton's announcement won't be heeded.

Rep. Helen Chenoweth, R-Idaho, met with Nettleton on Sunday. She said his actions were appropriate because the Federal Land Management Act clearly states the BLM must contact the sheriff in enforcement actions.

Nettleton has said he is angry because a BLM ranger once confiscated a "no trespassing" sign that a farmer installed on public land without letting the farmer know about it first.

He also has said his cash-strapped county has been denied rock-climbing training and equipment from the BLM, although his deputies and medical teams were injuring themselves during rescue attempts, Nettleton said.

"Our county sheriff is very smart, studies the law and knows the degree of his authority," Chenoweth said of Nettleton. "And he protects his people."

Nettleton said he has received strong support from residents, who think BLM rangers are "insensitive to the people they're around."

Bass worries a lawsuit is in the offing and the county should put together files on alleged problems, with the idea it is going to court.

Valley County Sheriff Lewis Pratt said the issue came up at a meeting of the Idaho Sheriffs' Association two weeks ago, when the sheriffs considered whether to support Chenoweth's legislation requiring federal officers to check in

with county sheriffs before taking action.

With only one dissenting vote, cast by Nettleton, the sheriffs decided not to throw their unequalled support behind Chenoweth, Pratt said.

That does not mean the sheriffs do not see some merit in parts of the legislation.

Pratt said they agreed with better communication between the two camps. The problem is not with local federal authorities, but those who come in to do a job and then leave local officers to clean up their mess, he said.

Bear Lake County Sheriff Brent Bunn, sheriffs' association president, said one part of Chenoweth's bill that troubles him is probable cause and the requirement the local agency has to agree probable cause does exist before a federal warrant is served.

"Any one of us may feel probable cause exists or doesn't as the case may be," he said.

"Conversely, a judge or attorney may have opposing positions. If a warrant has been acquired, then it would appear that probable cause has already been established."

In the Magic Valley, several local sheriffs have expressed support for federal law-enforcement authorities.

Ground work starts at new school

GOODING — Heavy equipment went to work this week grading the 25-acre site for a new elementary school.

Gooding School Superintendent Henry Kilmer said the ground is being leveled in preparation for the new building foundation. Irrigation lines are being rerouted and lines for water and sewer are being laid.

"They have a lot of dirt to move around," Kilmer said.

Bids for construction will be opened June 20, he said, and building is expected to begin in mid-July. The new school is scheduled to be ready for the 1996-97 school year.

In other matters: The School Board this week passed the 1995-96 fiscal year budget. Total expenditures are expected to be \$4,506,000 compared to the previous year's total of \$3,953,000. The increase, funded largely by the state, is due mainly to increased enrollment, inflation and several new programs in the district.

Kilmer said part of the budget plan is to rebuild the district's new alternate high school, which will be funded by the state. Enrollment in the Gooding Accelerated Learning Center will be about 30 or more, Kilmer predicted. Classes will be held at the middle school beginning at 4 p.m.

Attendance requirements are strict for the three-hour classes four days a week, he said, but students will be able to earn credits in six weeks. Students may come from anywhere to attend.

"This is for students that, for whatever reason, cannot meet the requirements of another program," Kilmer said.

Qualifications to attend the alternative school are varied and are listed by the state, he added. For more information, call the district office at 934-4321.

Gooding also has added a summer migrant school two days a week. About 50 students are enrolled in this reading program at the elementary school.

In a schedule change at the middle school, students will have an eight-period "roll over" curriculum.

Instead of seven periods a day, a student will have eight classes in two days. For this new schedule, the district hired an additional language arts teacher.

"This will keep kids with the same teacher for longer periods of time each day so they don't bounce from class to class," Kilmer explained. "It will give us better student control and more time for classroom assistance."

Katie Faulkner was hired to teach language arts and Sally Bergstrom was hired as a middle school counselor.

This year approved enrollment of two foreign exchange students, a girl from Scotland and a boy from Japan.

Also on the agenda was a proposal to limit time students are away from home at athletic activities during the school week. The board did not reach a decision on the Canyon Conference plan to reschedule all sporting events to Friday evening and Saturday.

Kidnapping suspects now face federal charges

RUPERT — Three men charged with kidnapping a Rupert teen and his 6-year-old niece and stealing their pickup truck last month now face federal kidnapping and carjacking charges.

Jose Cayetano Romo to Villa, 22, Jesus Ortega Reyes, 28, and Juan Jose Romero, 20, were indicted by a federal grand jury Wednesday. Minidoka County Prosecuting Attorney Gara Newman and U.S. Attorney Betty H. Richardson announced Thursday.

They will be tried in federal court in Boise.

The three men are accused of kidnapping Justin Warr, 16, and Kayla Warr, 6, on May 25 at Ridley's Food and Drug in Rupert, by using a knife to threaten Justin Warr and take control of the pickup — he had been driving.

The suspects were arrested early the next morning south of Fillmore, Utah, after they drove away from a service station without paying for their gas. The Warrs were found safe nearly 90 miles south of Salt Lake City at the Yuba Lake State Park turnoff on Interstate 15, where they had been dropped off by their kidnappers.

Newman will prosecute the case with Assistant U.S. Attorney Barry McHugh. It is the first carjacking case to be prosecuted in federal court in the District of Idaho. State kidnapping and robbery charges against the three men will be dismissed.

Kidnapping carries a sentence of up to life in prison and a \$250,000 fine, while carjacking carries up to a 15 year prison sentence and a \$250,000 fine, according to the U.S. Attorney's office.

The U.S. Border Patrol says the three men are illegal immigrants.

The men must serve any court sentence should they be convicted of the crime, said Ted Denning, deputy chief patrol for the U.S. Border Patrol in Hever, Mont. Afterward, a warrant for their deportation probably would be waiting for them, and they would be returned to Mexico, Denning said.

Accused: Drug binge preceded theft

JEROME — Kenneth Duane Evans told police Thursday he awoke from a nine-day drug binge in the burning cab of a stolen fence truck, according to a deputy sheriff.

His motorcycle, camper shell, a black BMW car and his boss' repair shop had been trashed during his wild Sunday night. He later told police he could only remember the sounds of shattering glass and flying tools and equipment.

The garage mechanic at Honkers the smoking truck at Honkers Mini-Mart, just south of Jerome, and eventually wound up in Jackpot, Nev. On Thursday, the 44-year-old man turned himself in, according to the Jerome County Sheriff's Department, saying he wanted to "clean up his act and change his way of life."

Evans, who was being held at the Jerome County Jail, will be arraigned today, probably on charges of malicious injury to property and grand theft, Chatterton said.

"He has a great deal of remorse," said Detective Dan Chatterton. "He was very, very drunk. He had realized early on that he screwed up bad, he hurt a lot of people and nearly killed himself."

Evans told past investigators he had spent the last nine days without sleep, tanked up on methamphetamine, before launching his frenzied rampage at Contractors Equipment Repair, where he had only worked for two weeks, Chatterton said.

Tools and equipment were strewn about the shop, and windows were broken by the time police arrived. Nearby, at Honkers Mini-Mart, witnesses saw a man circle the gas station in a fence truck then ram the pumps and start a fire.

Evans, who was being held at the Jerome County Jail, will be arraigned today, probably on charges of malicious injury to property and grand theft, Chatterton said.

Wife of man who shot officer will face federal indictment

ST. ANTHONY (AP) — The wife of a man who shot an Idaho State Police trooper is not only state charges but a federal indictment, U.S. Attorney Betty Richardson announced Thursday.

Cindy Bosserman likely knew her husband intended to shoot Cpl. Ismael "Junior" Gonzales in a May 29 traffic stop, 7th District Magistrate Keith Walker.

Walker brought her over Wednesday to district court for a June 26 arraignment on charges of aggravated battery and felony eluding an officer. The prosecution dropped an additional charge of

using a firearm to commit a felony.

"This court does not believe there is any more acquiescence," Walker said, finding she participated in the shooting even if Steven Bosserman pulled the trigger. Gonzales was wearing a bulletproof vest and was not seriously injured.

A Boise grand jury this week returned an indictment on charges of transportation of a stolen vehicle and possession of stolen firearms.

Steven Bosserman, 24, committed suicide early May 30 during a standoff in a barn along the Fall River several miles from the scene of the traffic stop.

Bosserman told FBI agent Bill Long she was tending to a puppy in his back seat. The puppy was pulled over by Gonzales. Long testified. The couple was driving a stolen Jeep Cherokee out of South Carolina.

If Bosserman is convicted on the federal charges, she could spend up to 10 years in prison and face a fine of \$250,000. The state charge of aggravated battery on an officer carries a maximum of 30 years.

Assistant U.S. attorney George Breitsmaier said a federal court date has not been set, pending the outcome of the state proceedings.

Welfare officers: State shouldn't pay for recipients' education

POCATELLO (AP) — Sixty percent of the parents receiving assistance from the state's Jobs Program in Bannock County are full-time students.

Staff workers from local welfare offices would like to see that percentage drop.

About 50 employees throughout Region 5 met Wednesday with Gov. Phil Batt's Welfare Reform Advisory Council to add their recommendations. The council is hearing testimony from each of the seven regions and will develop a reform bill before the Legislature meets in January.

Full-time college students took a lot of bashing.

"They're taking advantage of the system because it's there," said Maria Stinger, client self-support specialist in Pocatello. "We're not

in the business of supplying four-year degrees."

Stinger spoke mainly of the JOBS and Unemployed Parents programs.

The JOBS program trains welfare recipients on how to apply and get jobs. Unemployed Parents provides cash to two-parent families in which the breadwinner is out of work. Both programs are funded by state and federal dollars.

But Sen. Gordon Crow, R-Hayden, pointed out that a mother

receiving Aid to Families funds who obtains a bachelor's degree stands a better chance of staying off welfare.

Stinger said there are federal programs that help students get their degrees without going on welfare.

"When I was a full-time student, I worked and I got financial aid. I didn't go on welfare," she said. "They're not going to take out a student loan when they can get AFDC to pay their living expenses."

The officers recommended students not willing to adapt the school schedules to full-time work should not be eligible for assistance. Another suggested that all student monies be counted as income when figuring eligibility. Currently, student loans, grants and work study income are not counted.

Stream bank work, fencing improves Portneuf River

LAVA HOT SPRINGS (AP) — Without the efforts of ranchers, farmers, scientists and anglers, the ailing Portneuf River is on the mend.

"There's an excellent opportunity to bring back an excellent fishery to this valley again," King Creek Grazing Association manager Steve Hedden told about three dozen people who toured the upper Portneuf Wednesday.

Around Hedden lay acres of lush green forage. The stream is separated from cattle by nine miles of volunteer help build since 1985.

Scientists found loss of riverside vegetation created less shade, raising water temperatures to levels fish couldn't tolerate.

Silt from grazing, crop land, runoff and severely eroded channel further damaged the once blue-ribbon trout fishery. Irrigators cut the 8-mile channel in the 1950s where the river flows out of Chesterfield Reservoir.

The Idaho Department of Fish and Game has supplied money for ranchers to drill a nearby well as a new water source for cattle.

A few miles downstream, the water carved out the outer bank. In the past, farmers placed rocks on stream banks to stabilize them, but the earth below would continue to erode.

Chris Hoag, a wetland plant ecologist with the U.S. Natural Resources Conservation Service, decided to try a combination of plants and fabric to stabilize the banks.

Crews harvested five truckloads of willows from the opposite bank and replanted them on the eroded bank. Hoag said he will monitor the project for the next three years.

Bannock County Commission Chairman Tom Kattilonges said the county could help other farmers whose land is threatened by bank erosion, using jail inmate labor.

Searchers find man lost in South Hills

ROCK CREEK — A mentally retarded Paul man walked out of the Sawtooth National Forest 16 hours after he wandered away from his campground into the woods.

After a night of drinking with friends, the 46-year-old man hiked for more than 16 miles out of the Rock Creek Canyon to Hansen Thursday, calling home shortly after 7 p.m.

He had disappeared from the Big Bluff campground near Harrington Fork in Cassia County around 3 a.m., his sister told police.

The Cassia County Sheriff's Department received a report from the man's sister around 1:30 p.m., more than 10 hours after he had disappeared.

Cassia County Deputy Sheriff Randy Kidd said the camping party spent the morning looking for him, then returned home before reporting him missing.

The man wandered off drunk early in the morning, Kidd said. His allow campers watched him walk down a gravel road wearing a maroon, terry cloth sweatshirt and black, cleated shoes.

The man had a history of wandering off, Kidd said, so the other campers were not immediately concerned when he left.

About 18 search and rescue personnel from Twin Falls, Cassia and Minidoka counties scoured a three-mile-long strip of rocky terrain deep in the bottom of Rock Creek Canyon looking for the man.

Searchers on horseback, motorcycle and on foot looked for the

man for four hours before he was reported found.

Rescue personnel were concerned the man may have been bitten by a rattlesnake in the steep, rugged country, or fallen into the fast flowing Rock Creek.

Alex, a bloodhound owned by Brent, Nicholas of Rupert also was called out to the search.

Utah deals with water from runoff

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — While serious or widespread flooding is considered unlikely, water experts say the danger of drownings during the current heavy snowpack runoff remains high.

"Rivers are full of cold water and when they're like that they're very dangerous and they're not to be messed with," warned Ed Vidmar, chief of operations and maintenance for the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation's Provo office.

In recent weeks, four people have drowned in Utah's swollen, turbulent streams as hot weather followed a spell of wet, snowpack-building weather.

"The human body can't take this real cold water very long, and people don't realize how cold it is until they're in it, and then it's too late," said Vidmar.

Thursday, water was spilling over five federal dams in Utah, and flood watches remained in effect through today for Little Cottonwood Creek, the Provo River, the Green River in northeast Utah and the Sevier River in southern Utah.

Declo accepts water bid, but scales down proposal

DECLO — The low bid of \$759,895.14 from Walton Inc. of Heyburn won the contract for the city's new water system.

But the project will have to be scaled down. The low bid came in under \$40,000 over the original engineering estimate. About \$30,000 of the unexpected increase was for electrical work. Mayor Jay Darrington said at this week's City Council meeting.

The council has decided to reduce the amount of service line from 8,000 to 7,000 feet. The number of new fire hydrants will be reduced from 20 to 18, and existing lines under the city's railroad crossing and under the corner of highways 81 and 77 will remain as they are. In addition, the city will fence its new well site.

The planned cutbacks won't make a big difference in the outcome of the project, Darrington said.

Councilman Andy Anderson agreed: "I don't see anything we've cut back that's going to hurt us."

After feeling the effects of an increase in water rates for more than a month now, council members have been getting some customer criticism. The 3,000 gallon base rate more than doubled from \$6.50 to \$16. The \$6.50 rate had been unchanged for about 30 years.

"After getting over the initial shock (the customers) are OK," Darrington said. "It will help when they start seeing the improvements."

Customers knew the increase has been coming for a long time, Anderson said. The increase was published in the local papers and a notice was sent by mail.

Darrington said that the average bill is around \$19 — still lower than Albion's \$20.50 base rate.

If the city were applying to Farmers Home Administration for a grant this year, "we wouldn't even be considered," he said. To be considered for grant funding, monthly water rates should be at least \$25.

Even higher rates may be in the future, Darrington said. The city is relying on water revenues to make the yearly water system payment of \$16,000 to FmHA. If all customer pays their bills, there's not a whole lot of money left over for maintenance, Darrington said.

In other council business: • New utility deposit rates were set at \$10; a water hookup fee set at \$10 for delinquent accounts.

A graffiti ordinance was adopted. It's the same ordinance that the city of Burley and Cassia County adopted recently. The ordinance says that graffiti is a misdemeanor and that parents can be held liable for damage caused by their children.

Dad faces assault charge for threatening to shoot son

TWIN FALLS — A man was charged with aggravated assault Thursday after police said he threatened to shoot his errant teenage son for breaking windows of a home owned by a local lawyer.

According to a police affidavit, lawyer Golden Bennett went to Bonny Khanthaulay's home Wednesday morning to talk to him about his 14-year-old son having broken the windows of his home.

Enraged, the 35-year-old Khanthaulay stormed into his bedroom, returned carrying a pistol grip shotgun and a bag of shotgun shells, and loaded it while yelling at his son, the affidavit said.

Khanthaulay pointed the loaded shotgun at his teenager and said he was going to kill him, the affidavit said. Bennett talked to him about taking the youth to the police station. Khanthaulay agreed, saying something like, "take him, we don't want him back," according to the affidavit.

Four years earlier, Khanthaulay had been arrested on a charge of child abuse; Khanthaulay said his son has been a problem in the past, the affidavit said.

The son is currently in the custody of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare.

Thursday, Khanthaulay posted \$5,000 bond. A preliminary hearing is set for 9:30 a.m. June 23, according to court minutes.

Rupert woman dies when truck rolls over

MILNER — A 24-year-old Rupert woman was crushed to death under her car Wednesday.

Spring McDermott-Heiner lost control of her 1986 Chevrolet Blazer in the gravel on Milner Road, according to a police report, and was thrown from the truck. The Blazer rolled over on top of her and killed her.

Two children in the car when it crashed suffered minor injuries. Chance Heiner, 6, and James McDermott, 14, were taken to Cassia Memorial Hospital. Cheyenne Heiner, 3, was fastened into a car seat and was not injured, the report said.

She was the only one in the truck who was wearing any restraints, the report said.

"Apparently the three children were able to get out of the vehicle," Cassia County Sheriff's Department Lt. Jim Hignis said.

The kids walked to a nearby trailer, looking for help, Hignis said. They found the trailer abandoned, he said,

and started walking farther down the road before being picked up by a driver in a passing vehicle. Cassia County Sheriff Sgt. Robert Nay found Heiner under the flipped Blazer. She was pronounced dead at the scene, the report said.

The three children involved in the crash were not notified until 2 p.m., shortly after a search was begun to locate them, the report said.

Heiner had been pinned under the car for almost 90 minutes before police found the accident, the report said. Police were not notified until Sgt. Nay was tagged down by another car that saw Heiner's car upside down.

According to the report, Heiner was driving west on Milner Road and was topping a hill when the rear of her car began sliding to the right. Heiner overcorrected, the report said, and the vehicle slid off the road, throwing her from the truck. The Blazer then rolled on top of her.

Gem labor leaders want state to run timber lands

LEWISTON (AP) — The Idaho AFL-CIO wants the state Department of Lands to take over management of timber lands in northern Idaho's national forests.

More than 100 delegates at the union's state convention approved a resolution on Wednesday seeking national AFL-CIO support for the proposal.

Labor leaders contend the Forest Service is in legal and political gridlock, making multiple use of the forests impossible and hurting Idaho timber workers.

Many Northwest mills have shut down forever, and a University of Idaho researcher has concluded at least five more mills in the Clearwater Valley alone will soon close because of the lack of federal timber sales, according to the resolution.

Paul Bartlett of the United Paperworkers International Union Local 712 in Lewiston said grassroots in northern Idaho groups have developed a proposal primarily aimed at the Clearwater, Nez Perce and Panhandle national forests. They met with Gov. Phil Batt about it last month, Bartlett said.

Batt's press secretary, Amy Kleiner, said the governor would be happy to go along with the proposal if the federal government also provided the money with which to manage the forest lands.

Officials at the Clearwater, Nez Perce and Panhandle national forests and the Idaho Conservation League said they had not heard about the AFL-CIO proposal. And John McCarthy, the Conservation League's conservation director in Boise, questioned why conservationists had not been consulted about it.

"It sure makes me suspicious that this isn't anything but to cut trees," McCarthy said. "Clearly, they are trying to squeeze out conservationists, which is stupid. It's not going to result in 'good forest management.'"

In a March 6 letter to Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee Chairman Frank Murkowski, Sen. Larry Craig vowed to conduct a U.S. Forest Service oversight hearing on federal land ownership and management.

"In this case, I would like to evaluate various proposals to shift responsibilities for some management functions to state and local governments, as well as proposals to divest the federal government of some assets," the Idaho Republican wrote.

Supremacist support chafes Chenoweth

Conservative Republican Congressman Helen Chenoweth is bristling again over the renewed praise she is receiving from white supremacists, this time in response to her staunch defense of the militia movement.

While denying the violence of the Oklahoma City bombing, Chenoweth has stood behind the militia even though partisans from both major parties have lashed out at movement leaders like Idaho's Sam Sherwood, who in January called for everyone to obtain an automatic rifle like the AK's used by the North Vietnamese during the Vietnam War.

And the racist tabloid "The Truth At Last" recognized Chenoweth's stand.

"She is certainly a better leader than the funny, whiny liberals like Patricia Schroeder or Jews like Dianne Feinstein," the Georgia-based newspaper said in a recent edition.

Schroeder is veteran Democratic Congresswoman from Colorado and Feinstein is the former San Francisco mayor and now Democratic senator from California.

"I repudiate the racist agenda," Chenoweth declared, "and want absolutely nothing to do with organizations that forward such an agenda."

The publication is headed by Edward Fields, a former Ku Klux Klan official who has been involved with the northern Idaho-based Involvement Nation. The edition that praised Chenoweth's militia stand included

articles headlined "Special Tax Breaks For Jews," "How Jews seized Disney and Time" and "Clinton's Newest Jewish Commissioners Over America."

Chenoweth again complained about Fields' use of a picture showing her waving 10 supporters because she contends it could be interpreted as her giving a Nazi salute.

Earlier this year after Chenoweth took office, the publication cited her defeat of two-term Democratic incumbent Larry LaRocco as proof "that a race-based campaign is a winner." It was based on a campaign statement that white Anglo-Saxon men are an endangered species during one of her many attacks on efforts to restore endangered salmon runs and other species.

Breast-cancer pioneer dies after fighting for 6 years

BOISE (AP) — Rebecca Shields lost her six-year battle with breast cancer, but her family and friends believe she helped women advance in the war over treatment costs.

Shields, 39, died Tuesday, two years after receiving a type of bone marrow transplant that her health insurance would not cover because the procedure is regarded as experimental for breast cancer.

Hewlett-Packard Co., where she worked, began paying for the treatment Jan. 1. The company, which is self-insured, administers its insurance through First Health in Salt Lake City.

"I think that's a tribute to Becky," said Frank Shields, her husband of seven years. "The Shields paid the rest. Up to \$50,000 Hewlett-Packard employees and their families run the fund-raising events."

Hewlett-Packard employee. "What Becky went through wasn't in vain." Shields' plight led her co-workers and other Boise residents to raise money for the procedure, which cost \$90,000. They raised \$75,000 through a baby-rummage sale and a raffle. The Shields paid the rest. Up to \$50,000 Hewlett-Packard employees and their families run the fund-raising events.

Rescuers work to save 3 kids swept from canoe

SANDPOINT (AP) — A vacationing Englishwoman spent her first day in Sandpoint helping save the lives of three children in Lake Pend Oreille.

A wave had overturned the trio's canoe into the cold water. Fourteen-year-old Sherree Simcox fought to keep her brother Terry, 11, from letting go of the slippery canoe bottom.

"On the way back, I thought I saw a log in the water. Then I realized, 'My God, that boat's overturned.' I could see kids trying to get back on it," Brooks said.

Brooks and McNelis called 911. They were told marine boats brushing the lake were up to 30 minutes away. McNelis sprinted a half-mile to his home to get his boat.

"Terry kept saying, 'Sissy, I love you. I don't know how much longer I can stay on the boat,'" said a shaken mother, Sharon Simcox.

Her two children and Derrick Stangel, 13, were safe Wednesday because of Judy Brooks, 34, of England, and her aunt Maisy Jones and friend David McNelis, 65.

McNelis and Brooks fired up his 22-foot motor boat and sped to the canoe. Sherree Simcox had swum below her brother to push him back onto the canoe. Terry was close to hypothermia, Marine Deputy Enayr Schultz said.

The three were walking on Sandpoint's Long Bridge shopping area and noticed the children canoeing 300 yards away.

"David just kept running," Brooks said. "He's not a spring chicken, you know."

Gulf deal close to completion

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Creditors fighting over Gulf USA Corp.'s assets following the closure of the Bunker Hill smelter complex are close to agreement on a plan to reorganize the bankrupt concern.

Gulf bondholders, pensioners, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Coeur d'Alene Indian Tribe have battled over Gulf's remains since 1993.

A proposed settlement was sent to creditors in April. Pensioners figure to get the largest share of the reorganized assets, more than \$40 million to maintain their medical benefits.

Tribe revises cleanup plan

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Facing criticism of ignoring fiscal reality, the Coeur d'Alene Indian Tribe has scaled back its proposal to clean up pollution in the Coeur d'Alene River Basin, slashing the original price in half.

"It may not be adequate to restore the basin," said Callie Rodolf, the tribe's engineering consultant. "But it's a starting point."

After being rebuffed for last year's \$1 billion cleanup proposal, the tribe is offering what it called a moderate plan that will cost \$515 million.

But even it is not expected to survive when citizens involved in the

Coeur d'Alene Basin Restoration Project meet next month to find middle ground with a \$121 million proposal offered by the mining industry.

Republican Sen. Larry Craig is looking to that group for guidance in drafting legislation on how to deal with the metals that threaten wildlife and human health.

The tribe proposes digging up tainted mine-tailings and removing them from the riverbanks, small lakes and wetlands as opposed to the industry proposal that only tailings that present special threats to people or animals should be cleaned up.

Service sets reward for glyph vandalism

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. (AP) — The National Park Service has offered a reward for information leading to the conviction of vandals who destroyed eight petroglyphs at Wupatki National Monument.

The petroglyphs are considered sacred by Indians.

The rock drawings were smashed and scraped with rocks, the second such incident at the monument in two years, said Todd Metzger, resource manager for the park. The drawings were intact as late as February. Their destruction was discovered last month.

TWIN FALLS — Idahoans, being a people who prize their backwoods heritage, seem to take inordinate pride in their encyclopedic knowledge of the Gem State.

A lot of them might be surprised. "It sometimes seems as if Idaho is three or four states," said Julie Fanselow, a Twin Falls author whose "Idaho Off the Beaten Path" was just published by The Globe Pequot Press.

"There are things out there to be discovered, even if you've been there before."

The book, part of a series of state guides issued by the Connecticut publishing house, aims for the wide spots in the road and the narrow crannies of the human imagination.

"All across Idaho residents and visitors have plenty of opportunities to get happily lost for a day, a weekend, or longer, on a seldom-traveled forest road, in an abandoned mountaintop fire tower, in a country antique store, or in a tucked-away cafe," Fanselow writes in the introduction to her book.

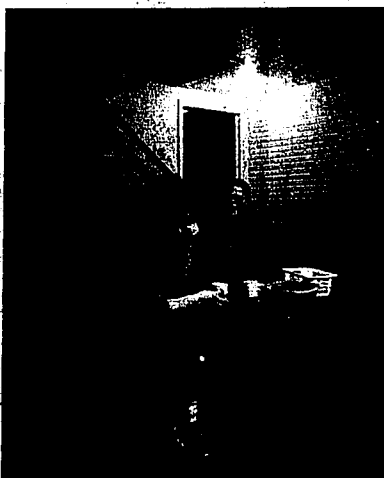

"One of my favorite places is Yellow Pine," Fenslow said of the central Idaho village of 44 that may be the state's most remote settlement. "It's a surprisingly lively place, with a real character named Richard Alves who runs a leather shop there."

Alves' business card reads, "Wars fought, governments run, tigers tamed, bridges destroyed, uprisings quelled, revolutions started and saloons emptied."

Fenslow, former Times-News reporter who edits The Monthly, a Twin Falls-based entertainment magazine, includes some of the best-kept secrets of the Magic Valley as well.

There are stops at such untouristy venues as Advance-to-Go Stained Glass in Hagerman, the Cosmic Jolt bookstore-coffeehouse in Buhl, and Independence Lakes, four lovely, remote alpine lakes on Cuche Peak in Cassia County.

Fenslow, whose "The Traveler's Guide to the Lewis and Clark Trail" was published last year and whose "The Traveler's Guide to the Oregon

Trail" was issued the year before, said she discovered many of the places in her new book in the process of doing research for two earlier works.

"Some I found out about by word of mouth," she said. "And some of them I found by just stopping to look and finding something interesting."

She hopes the guide will be used by Idahoans who want a closer look at their state and by out-of-staters seeking to sample a slice of Idaho.

"I hope people will pick up a copy, tuck it away and take it with them when they're on the road."

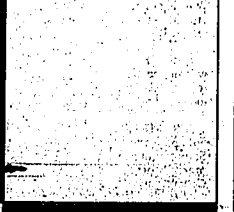



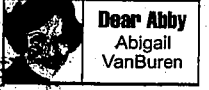

'Disclosure' reaches local video shelves

New movies in Twin Falls video stores this week:

"Disclosure" (R) — Tom Sanders is riding high at DigiCom, a high-tech corporation that's involved in a high-stakes merger. He heads the advanced operations team and expects to be appointed his division's vice president.

Instead, Sanders (Michael Douglas) is passed over for a woman, an ex-lover named Meredith Johnson (Demi Moore) who takes no prisoners as she climbs the corporate ladder.

What follows in Barry Levinson's "Disclosure" is an imbroglio over sexual harassment in the workplace and a convoluted plot surrounding the merger. None of it rings true.

The problem is not entirely Levinson's, nor should blame be placed on screenwriter Paul Attanasio.

The fault, dear viewer, is in the Michael Crichton novel upon which this movie is based. To begin with, the story simply lacks credibility and juice. But where Crichton jazzed up the plot with some fantastic journeyes into virtual reality, the movie only gives us a passing glance and misses a major opportunity for a thrilling climax.

"Disclosure" is filled with all the toys of the 90s, and they all play a role in the movie: cellular phones, computers of every description, e-mail, CD-ROM. But, unfortunately, the very best technology offered in the story largely is ignored — a virtual reality computer filing system called The Corridor. The user steps onto a pad, dons a headset and a pair of gloves, faces a monitor and proceeds to walk along the corridor, opening doors, files, etc.

What could be more visual for film?

Attanasio does try to add some humor to his script, tossing some lines to comedian-Dennis-Miller-as-DigiCom's head of design. (Oddly, Miller disappears midway through the movie.)

Ordinarily, it's a lesson in the ignobility of man and the superiority of nature. But not always.

In "Far From Home: The Adventures of Yellow Dog," the boy is as admirable as the pup — more so, perhaps, because he does at least as much as the dog to help them survive their grueling ordeal amid the virgin, hostile terrain of British Columbia. This interspecies quality may be heretical, but it also lifts the film well above the usual nature adventure.

The talented Jesse Bradford seems to be specializing in adolescent boys surviving on hostile terrain. In Steven Soderbergh's underappreciated "King of the Hill," he was left to his own devices in a Depression-era St. Louis hotel, while his unstable family tried to right itself. At least

his domestic situation has improved: As Angus, self-sufficient scion of the McCormick family, he lives a rather ideal life on the rough-hewn Canadian coast with a mother (Mimi Rogers) a father (Bruce Davison), brother (Joel Palmer) and, after the dog adopts him, Yellow (Dakohn), a well-trained Labrador who's turned up mysteriously one day and attached himself to Angus.

He's a remarkably self-sufficient lad — his father has taught him survival techniques, and in their rustic world these things are part of the non-academic education. H

Kids will admire Angus' survival skills. So will adults. He helps, he claims, he sees himself waterlog, he cooks outdoors, and makes a feast. The land is beautiful and Angus is Huck Finn. Then, the land turns harsh. The food disappears. The rain won't cease and Angus starts to pall. He has to demolish his boat so he can make a signal fire. He's always in the wrong spot when a plane flies overhead. He starts running out of matches. He finally cries, and it's about time. (Newsday) (Video West, Blockbuster, Hastings, Old Towne Video)

"Drop Zone" (R) — This movie takes a literal view of the high concept movie, with skydivers — some of whom seem to regard a parachute as a wimpy luxury — jumping recklessly from their planes. Their stunts defy gravity as much as John Badham's movie cheerfully defies sense.

Since Andrew Bergman regaled us with that unforgettable cascade of skydiving Elvis impersonators in the hilarious finale to "Honeymoon in Vegas," the sport's possibilities in action films have surely been curtailed. That consideration hasn't fazed Badham, and "Drop Zone" returns him to the high-tech fascinations that yielded such flashy entertainments as "Blue Thunder" and "WarGames. As you would expect, Drop Zone is dizzyingly effective when it's up in the air and plodding and far-fetched when it is forced to come down to earth and attend to such mundane matters as plot and plausible motive.

The screenplay has the jerky rhythm and progressively sillier developments that suggest its writers were stuck with the thankless task of coming up with a story to fit the now lofty concept of skydiving nar-

coterritors and the cops who pursue them above the clouds. In this case, high concept reaches all too often to the heights of absurdity.

The opening of the movie aboard a Boeing 747 amounts to far wanting. Here Wesley Snipes, looking as if he never stepped off the plane from "Passenger 57," is once again in the middle of an airborne crisis. He is a federal marshal — as is his brother. On suspension, where all good burned-out cop movies start, Nessim becomes a maverick investigator bent on finding the crooks whose actions killed his brother. The kidnapper is a computer whiz, and he has been whisked away by a devious sycho named Ty Moncrieff (Gary Busey).

It took almost 45 minutes, but eventually, America got the answers it was waiting for.

First, did Michael Jackson and Lisa Marie Presley have sex? "Yes, yes, yes," said Lisa Marie, after remarking that she couldn't believe the fans would ask that.

Second, are they expecting a child? "I won't say when," answered Lisa Marie, with Michael adding, "It's in the hands of the heavens."

Not exactly the most hard-hitting journalism, true, but then again, the Michael-Jackson saga isn't exactly on par with the latest developments in Bosnia. Of course, if it were, then there probably wouldn't have been millions watching when Diane Sawyer interviewed Jackson and Presley on ABC's "Prime Time Live" Wednesday night.

Arriving in the midst of a massive, pre-release promotional blitz, the interview seemed at first like just one more cog in the Michael Jackson marketing machine. With the release of his new album, "HIStory," just six days away, Jackson is assured of being an almost constant presence in the entertainment media in upcoming weeks. This was just ABC's turn at the trough.

True, the show did come on like actual, hard-hitting journalism. Sawyer announced at the beginning of the show that there were no gay aids, and a pre-taped recap of the sexual abuse charges against Jackson in 1993 seemed to suggest that the only reason the singer wasn't charged was that none of the children involved agreed to testify against him.

But when asked about the allegations — all of which were eventually dismissed by the Los Angeles

County District Attorney — Jackson, of course, denied everything.

"It's not in my heart," he said. "It's not who I am."

Go, Diane, what did you expect? An on-air confession?

Jackson's anger over the charges was obvious. Claiming that he agreed to an out-of-court settlement only because it was the quickest way to end the ordeal, he raged against the indignities he was sub-

jected to. "It was unfair, what they put me through," he said.

Sawyer, pressing the point, mentioned the kids who've crept into bed with Jackson and asked if he didn't have a responsibility to stop them. Answered Lisa Marie, "I've seen these children. They won't even let him go to the bathroom without following him there."

Well, then, Sawyer asked, what about your own children? Would you be let them spend the

night with Michael Jackson?

"If I didn't know Michael, and know who he is and what he is?" Presley responded. "No way. No way."

That, more than anything Jackson himself said, seemed to quell all the doubts about Jackson's interest in children.

Because no matter how calculated or rehearsed his answers might have seemed, Lisa Marie seemed to be speaking from the heart, without

Millions tune in to broadcast

NEW YORK (AP) — About one in four Americans saw at least part of Diane Sawyer's interview with Michael Jackson and wife Lisa Marie on ABC.

ABC estimated 60 million viewers tuned in at some point during Wednesday's one-hour "PrimeTime Live," which also included the network premiere of Jackson's "Scream" music video.

The audience fell short of the mark set by Oprah Winfrey's 90-minute interview with Jackson in 1993, also on ABC. That attracted more than 62 million viewers.

The most-watched non-sports shows of all time were the 1983

"M-A-S-H" finale, seen by 93.05 million viewers, and the final "Cheers" episode in 1993, watched by 121.6 million people.

This year's Super Bowl, by comparison, was seen by an estimated 121.1 million people. "PrimeTime Live" earned a 29.0 rating and attracted 44 percent of the TV audience in overnight ratings from the nation's 33 biggest cities, according to Nielsen Media Research.

On NBC, the final game of the National Basketball Association championship playoffs got a 15.2 rating and a 23 audience share.

'Batman Forever': Dark Knight light

3rd time proves charm with Kilmer more comfortable as caped crusader; villains having fun with roles

Despite their bloated grosses, the first two "Batman" movies were flawed entertainments.

Movie review

Jack Nicholson's over-the-top Joker so dominated the first film that Michael Keaton's Batman was overshadowed. Both the mood and the photography of "Batman Returns" were bleak as a ton and Danny DeVito's Penguin was too grotesque even for a comic-book movie.

"Batman Forever" introduces a new hero and equips him with his oldtime sidekick, Robin. Both moves prove propitious.

Michael Keaton never appeared comfortable as Batman; he always seemed to be collecting a big salary while looking forward to something more deserving of his talents. His successor, Val Kilmer, seems a perfect fit. His brooding face has the melancholy of a man who has seen his parents murdered.

The reintroduction of Robin is deftly managed. The script portrays him as a member of a family serial act who loses his parents to the perfidy of the psychotic Two-Face (hence the parallel to Batman's loss). He seeks revenge by becoming Batman's ally.

Chris O'Donnell, one of the best of the new acting generation, creates a 1990s Robin, manly and forceful, not nearly as young as the original.

Warner Bros. exercised good judgment in shelling out big bucks for the villains. As with Dick Tracy, these gargoyles supply the power to propel the absurd happenings.

Tommy Lee Jones, his face half-melted in scarlet latex, pulls out all the stops as Two-Face, the onetime district attorney disfigured by the

Mob. He rants, he roars, he leads his masked marauders in terrorist attacks on the good people of Gotham City.

Jones faces real danger of being ousted by Jim Carrey as the proto-teen Riddler. He begins as Edward Nygma (E-Nygma — get it?), a

wacko scientist in Wayne Enterprises. He soon graduates to outright terrorism as the sometime ally of Two-Face. This kind of role is perfect for the rubber-limbed, mobile-faced Carrey, and he dominates every scene.

The female interest is supplied by

Nicole Kidman, a criminal-psychologist who is mad for Batman. Or is it Bruce Wayne? She's a brainy scientist, but she can't figure out that they have the same voice and the same shaped mouth.

Two stalwarts return from the previous versions: Michael Gough in his marvelous turn as the Wayne-butler-mentor, and Pat Hingle as the honest but thick-headed police commissioner.

Tim Burton, who directed the first two films, shares the producer credit with Peter-MacGregor-Scott, Joel Schumacher ("The Client") took over the director duties, and he does an expert job of integrating the story with special effects.

Barban Ling deserves credit for the imaginative production design. Note to those with sensitive hearing: "Batman Forever" may be the noisiest of recent films, the sound system resonating with each explosion.

The Joker
Cesar Romero revealed an occasional nasty edge as TV's Joker, but Jack Nicholson cranked the ham factor into overdrive in "Batman" — and stole the movie from the somber Michael Keaton. Nicholson's laugh never will stand up to Romero's maniacal cackling, but the Jack brought a dangerous air to the role. "This town needs an enemy!" He was violent, impulsive and downright nuts — the definitive live-action Joker.

Catwoman
Michelle Pfeiffer surprised a lot of people with her sexy, skintight leather version of the Catwoman in "Batman Returns," but she gets stiff competition from the trio that took turns with the role on TV. Julie Newmar, Lee Meriwether and especially Eartha Kitt all added their own sultriness to the bad girl locked in a love-hate relationship with Batman. Still, Pfeiffer squeaks past the competition: Her "meow" was simply to die for.

The Penguin
Danny DeVito had some truly ghoulish makeup to go along with his fish-eating Penguin in

"Batman Returns," but Burgess Meredith's interpretation was more memorable: It virtually immortalized the actor, haunting every role he took on afterward.

The Riddler
Casting Jim Carrey as the Riddler might seem an inspired (if obvious) choice, but the end result is a bit disappointing. He's just not that funny. Much better was Frank Gorshin, who seemed appropriately rubbery on the TV show and had much better lines to work with—John Astin, who also played the TV role, is a lame third.

'Braveheart' a bloody but powerful film

"Braveheart" (R) — Mel Gibson's three-hour historical epic, which he not only stars in but also directs, is a relentlessly bloody and powerfully stirring look at the medieval price of freedom. The people fighting for it are 13th-Century Scots; their enemy is English King Edward I. Gibson stages spectacular battle sequences and gives a forceful lead performance. Despite a few minor flourishes as both director and star, he triumphs. Extraordinary gore. (Twin Cinema, Burley Theater, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

"The Bridges of Madison County" (PG-13) — Director-star Clint Eastwood and co-star Meryl Streep as a globe-trotting photographer and the Iowa farm wife he romances for four fleeting days in 1965 — chalk up a minor miracle, wringing an honestly touching love story from a book that was truly bad. The movie plays less on the deftly machiavolo of the Eastwood character and more on Streep's Francesca, caught in a conflict between passion and commitment. Mild sex scenes, partial nudity, foul language. (Mall Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley)

"Congo" (PG-13) — Primateologist Peter (Dylan Walsh) has created a device that allows his gorilla, Amy, to speak. When Amy insists on returning to her jungle home in the Congo, an expedition is formed. The two become unlikely partners with Karen (Lauri Lancy), Tim Curry, and Ernie Hudson in a search for the legendary lost city of Zinj and its fabled diamond mines. The storyline combined with exploding volcanoes, ruined temple and a frenzied pace are reminiscent of an old Tarzan movie. (Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Ketchum)

"Crimson Tide" (R) — An even

better ride than last summer's "Speed," and with the same hurtling momentum. Gene Hackman and Denzel Washington are warring officers aboard a nuclear submarine with orders to launch a strike. Will they or won't they? Tense tension, powerful acting and a smart screenplay with some unexpectedly rich layers save a clumsy start. Violence, foul language. (Twin Cinema, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

"The Cure" (PG-13) — The story of an unlikely friendship between two lonely 11-year-old boys, one of whom is dying of AIDS. Joseph Mazello ("Jurassic Park") and Brad Renfro ("The Client") star. (Twin Cinema)

"Die Hard with a Vengeance" (R) — The third in the "Die Hard" series is the least fun, in no small part because it all seems too familiar and predictable. This one sends supercop Bruce Willis scurrying around New York City to defuse bombs and chase terrorist Jeremy Irons, blessedly, it gives him the tart Samuel L. Jackson as a sidekick. Extreme violence, foul language. (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum)

"Forget Paris" (PG-13) — An amiable romantic comedy about an NBA referee (Billy Crystal) and the woman (Debra Winger) who loves him. Crystal, who also directed, plays the usual engaging wisecracker to the vulnerable insides. Vulgarity, masturbation jokes. (Grand-Vu

Drive-in, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchum, Ace Theatre of Wendell)

"French Kiss" (PG-13) — It's more like a peck on the cheek — pleasant enough, but innocuous and unexciting. Meg Ryan's boyfriend ditched her for a hot number he meets in France; she jets over to shadow him, and is herself shadowed by a Frenchman (Kevin Kline). This is largely as a showcase for Ryan. It's meta-Meg, maxi-Meg — a Megapulozo. (Grand-Vu Drive-in, Gooding Cinema)

"Johnny Mnemonic" (R) — Even the techno-nerds will have a hard time finding qualities to admire in this shabby throwaway film about a human computer engaged in information thievery. For not even Keanu Reeves does much to save this story, which is scarcely more than a scenario for some simplistic video game. Extreme violence, language, adult situations. (Twin Cinema)

"Mad Love" (PG-13) — The title turns out to be literal: This movie explores a teen love affair hampered by the fact that the girl involved (Drew Barrymore) is mentally ill. Upon learning this, her beau (Chris O'Donnell) hits the road with her to prevent her institutionalization. Sound doves? It is — and Barrymore gives a performance that's annoying in the extreme. Sexual situations,

mildly foul language, gunplay. (Motor-Vu Drive-in)

"While You Were Sleeping" (PG-13) — Lucy's in love with Peter. His family's in love with her. There's one problem: He barely knows she exists, and should he come out of his coma, everyone's belief that she's his fiancée will be put to rest. Sandra Bullock, so endearing in "Speed," proves doubly charming in this irresistible romantic comedy, which also features a terrific Bill Pullman as another love interest. Some sexual innuendoes. (Twin Cinema, Ace Theatre of Wendell)

Backbeat

For Soul Asylum, success becomes a good alternative

Mainstream success is probably the toughest hurdle facing any alterna-rock act these days. Fortunately, that's not a problem for Soul Asylum, whose new album, "Let Your Dim Light Shine" (Columbia), clears that obstacle with astonishing grace and ease.

That success would be a problem of any sort may at first seem hard to believe. There are enormous advantages to having a single in the Top 40 and an album in the Top 10, in addition to fame and fortune, chart-topping rock acts earn the chance to wield real clout within the industry (just look at Pearl Jam). But selling millions of albums also puts alterna acts that much closer to throwaway pop kids, it was one of 1993's most memorable message songs. It was also far more pop-friendly than anything else in Soul Asylum's catalog, giving the band an audience far broader and more mainstream than anyone would have dreamed. As a result, many wondered which direction the follow-up would take: A hard right into Top-40 territory, or an abrupt left into alterna-rock insularity?

Neither. Soul Asylum just kept going straight and floored it. "Misery," which opens "Let Your Dim Light Shine," is a perfect example. At once punchy and pretty, it shows off both the band's musical might and David Pinner's songwriting skills. "Misery" is about just that, but where a lesser writer would attempt to turn this reflection on angst into some sort of sweeping statement, Pinner plays it as a sort of generational joke.

"They say misery loves company," he sings, adding that the firm could be called "Frustrated Incorporated." It's a sublime send-up of the way people tend to wallow in their own unhappiness, but the lyric works even better when applied

to the way popular culture has tried to sell disaffection back to the "slackers" who allegedly personify it. It's hard not to think of Levi's ads and "Reality Bites" as lines like "We'll create the cure! We made the disease" cascade from the speakers.

As biting as such satire is, there isn't anything mean-spirited or dismissive about "Misery." If anything, the slow-building verse and surging chorus offer a sense of triumph, as if by laughing along with Soul Asylum the listener, too, will be unhappily.

"Misery" may start off the album with a bang, but it's hardly the only

bright moment on "Let Your Dim Light Shine." "Bittersweetheart" is a catchy, clever meditation on romantic misadventures that recalls the sparkle of "Someone to Shove," but with louder guitars and a more resilient melody, while the blend of pop tunefulness and hard-rock music in "Hops Up" cleverly updates the power-pop sound of classic Cheap Trick. Then there's "Crawl" which shifts from whispered verse to amp-taxing chorus with such natural grace that it's hard not to smile every time the power chords kick in.

The band's devotion to accessibility isn't going to please every listener. Some fans will undoubtedly sneer that the moody, self-absorbed "To My Own Devices" is a little too close to Guns N' Roses for comfort. Don't worry — snuff like the noisy, style-shifting "Caged Rat" more than maintains the balance.

Besides, few people in rock 'n' roll can convey character in a song as well as Dave Pinner does. Whether he's stringing together a series of vignettes as tightly focused as those in the gorgeous, melancholy "Eyes of a Child" or dealing with a shaggy-dog story like the one meandering through "String of Pearls," Pinner imparts real substance to the people in his songs.

But it isn't just the words that do it; his music completes the picture, charting the emotional currents so vividly that it's hard not to share the longing for celebrity described in "Just Like Anyone."

Great rock 'n' roll has always done that. It's just that few bands make it seem as easy as Soul Asylum does on "Let Your Dim Light Shine."

State will add softball championship in '97

BOISE — By the spring of 1997, high school softball will have one state championship for each division.

On June 12, the Idaho High School Activities Association voted to adopt a state championship softball. Whether it will be fast pitch or slow pitch has yet to be decided.

According to Bill Young, director of the IHSAA, surveys will be sent out to all the schools in September. Each school will vote for either slow or fast pitch.

It is possible that a couple of classifications would go fast and the others would go slow. Right now, a majority of Class A-1 schools are fast pitch.

Young said that the A-2 schools might also lean toward fast pitch.

“You have to get the input from the schools,” Young said. “I would hate to tell the A-1s they had to go slow pitch or the A-2s they had to go fast pitch.”

The original proposal included adding slow pitch in the fall and fast pitch in the spring.

“There was no support for that,” Young said. “The idea was that we needed to do something with our softball.”

All of the ballots are counted, the IHSAA will make the decision in December.

“By June next year we will determine the format and structure of the state tournament,” Young said.

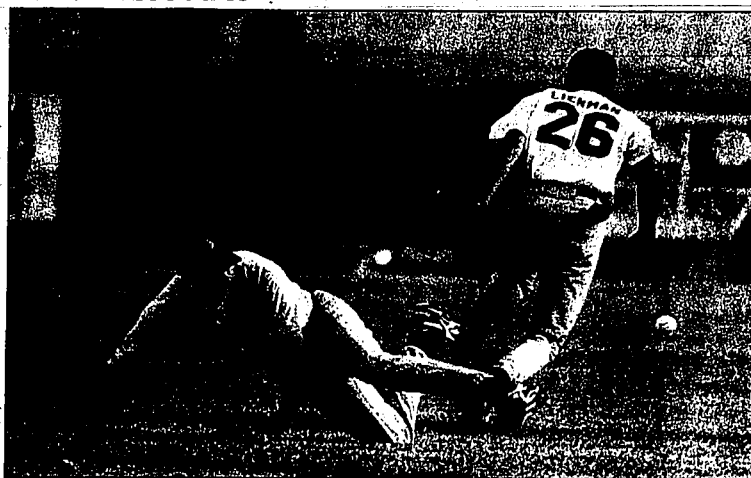

Riley quits Knicks, seeks more power

NEW YORK — To Pat Riley, it wasn't the money. It was power.

When the New York Knicks balked at his bid to become part owner, the coach resigned Thursday, walking away with a year left on his contract and turning down a five-year, \$15 million extension.

His departure fueled speculation in Miami that Riley may be in line for the vacant Heat coaching job. University of Cincinnati coach Bob Huggins emerged Thursday as a leading candidate to coach the Heat, but the field became more crowded with Riley's resignation.

Riley's name repeatedly has been mentioned in reports as a possible replacement for interim coach Alvin Gentry, who was fired last month.

But the union seems unlikely. While Riley's availability may spark interest in Miami, his philosophy conflicts with that of Dave Wohl, the Heat's executive vice president of basketball operations and Riley's assistant with the Lakers from 1982-85.

Meanwhile Riley and Knicks management sparred over his reasons for leaving.

“I emphasize that the decision to leave the Knicks had absolutely nothing to do with money,” Riley said. “The financial package which we had been discussing was extremely generous. Regrettably, there were serious differences and questions about authority and final decision-making.”

“I do not believe that any team can realize its potential when its head coach, the person most intimately involved with the players, cannot make final, critical decisions on matters bearing directly and intensely on the team, its performance and its future.”

Salt Lake City awaits decision 'cautiously'

BUDAPEST, Hungary — The view from the balcony was certainly the Danube River, but inside the hotel room here Thursday, International Olympic Committee members were sitting next to plastic pine trees laden with fake snow, listening to country music, munching salsa-dipped tortilla chips and gazing at a four-wall mural of Salt Lake City's Wasatch mountains.

After nearly three decades of bidding for the Winter Olympic Games, Salt Lake City makes what it vows will be its last try Friday when the 96 members of the IOC vote by secret ballot for the city that will have the Games in 2002. Salt Lake City's hospitality suite at the Marriott hotel in Budapest is part of the last-minute effort to remind the voters of the Utah city's frontier image.

“The official line is that we are cautiously — cautiously — optimistic,” said Bob Bills, a member of Salt Lake City's bid committee. “We've been told that we're the front-runner, but not by the IOC. And until that decision is made...”

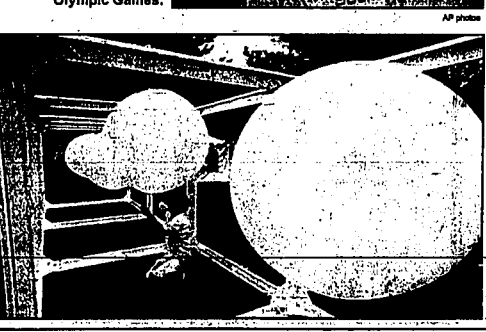
After pausing to greet two visitors in fluent French and Spanish, Bills said, “We're relaxed, but we're not laid back. We are, once again, putting our best foot forward.”

Salt Lake City, which narrowly lost its bid for the 1998 Olympics to Nagano, Japan, in balloting four years ago, is competing this time against Quebec City, Switzerland, and Oestermund, Sweden. IOC officials acknowledged that Utah's biggest city, which received the top marks in an IOC evaluation of the nine original candidates last year, is the odds-on favorite.

But the committee is unpredictable. Salt Lake City, also the front runner in 1991, lost then to Nagano because the IOC was reluctant to choose another U.S. city so soon after awarding the 1996 Summer Games to Atlanta.

Salt Lake City would be the largest city to get the Winter Games, and the first American city since Lake Placid, N.Y., in 1980.

Norway ends U.S. hopes of soccer repeat

—VASTERAS, Sweden (AP)—The United States knew it was the first Women's World Cup four years ago, won't be repeating as champion.

Ann-Kristin Aronnes beat goalkeeper Briana Scurry with a header off a corner kick Thursday, giving Norway a 1-0 victory over the Americans in the semifinals.

Four years ago, the United States beat Norway 2-1 in the final on a pair of goals by Michelle Akers. She started Thursday for the first time since this year's tournament opener against China, when she sustained a mild concussion and a strained neck just six minutes in.

Defender Gro Espeseth took the corner kick in the 10th minute and Aronnes beat Scurry with a header just under the crossbar.

"It was not a difficult goal," Aronnes said. "I just went up. But the game was a lot tougher. We weren't sure to win until the referee blew the final whistle."

The Norwegians will European champion Germany in Sunday's final at Stockholm. The Germans beat China 1-0 Thursday on Bettina Wiegmann's 79th-minute goal at Helsingborg.

Four years ago, the United States beat Norway 2-1 in the final on a pair of goals by Michelle Akers. She started Thursday for the first time since this year's tournament opener against China, when she sustained a mild concussion and a strained neck just six minutes in.

Against Norway, she was slow on the ball. "Michelle wasn't quite a 100 percent," DiCiccio said. "She didn't have her burst of

Joyner-Kersey wins agonizing heptathlon title

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — For Jackie Joyner-Kersey, it was not pretty. It was, however, another win.

Joyner-Kersey, battling a series of injuries, asthma, allergies, rain, wind and cold, won her sixth national heptathlon title Thursday night at the USA Mobil Championships at weather-plagued Hughes Stadium.

The 33-year-old Joyner-Kersey finished the seven-event, two-day competition with 6,375 points, her lowest total since finishing second in the 1984 Olympics with 6,363. Still, it was her 19th consecutive victory in a heptathlon she has completed since then.

This one, she almost didn't finish.

After Wednesday's first four events, she nearly flamed. During Thursday's final event, the 800 meters, she ran with a purple and black cloth allergy mask that helped her breathe. It didn't help her run fast, though, as she struggled in the final 100 meters.

This was Joyner-Kersey's first heptathlon of the year and it showed her lack of conditioning. Her time of 24:36 seconds in the 200 meters was her slowest ever. Her first-day total of 3,836 points was her worst since the Los Angeles Games. Her javelin throw of 29.66 feet, 11 inches was her worst since 1987, and her 2:26.39 for the 800 was her slowest since 1987.

"I'm not disappointed, but embarrassed," Joyner-Kersey said. "I'm a much better athlete than that. I know I can score better than 6,300. I asked my body to do something that it wasn't ready to do."

"I'm not washed up. I just need to put it together."

"It was more mental than physical," her coach and husband, Bob Kersey, said, of his wife's struggles during the first day. "From April to May, she had nagging injuries. In the last indoor meet, she strained a hamstring. Then she got Achilles tendinitis and finally she strained her groin."

"Her first-day score in the World Championships can improve by 300 or 400 points. The only thing she needs is competition."

"She also needs a healthy body. And that's what my job is — to get her through four more meets — here, the World Championships, the Olympic trials and the Olympic Games."

Red Wings, Devils take to the ice

Wings hope to see more octopuses in finals

DETROIT (AP) — Pete Cusimano was the first guy to throw an octopus on the ice at a Detroit Red Wings hockey game. Had he known how the tradition would grow, he'd have covered the market.

Cusimano, who ran a fish and poultry market, did the ugly deed first on April 13, 1952. Now, as the Red Wings prepare for the Stanley Cup finals against the New Jersey Devils, throwing octopuses is a tradition.

"I wish I had known 40 years ago," said Cusimano, 68. "I would have looked up this thing and retired. But, who could know?"

Cusimano and his brother, Jerry, were avid Red Wings fans back when the great Gordie Howe was in his prime and Detroit ruled the six-team NHL.

That season, the Red Wings had already swept the Toronto Maple Leafs and were up 2-0

on the Montreal Canadiens in the finals. It only took eight wins to capture the Stanley Cup in those days, but no team had ever done it in the minimum eight games.

"We were putting out a display of fish," Cusimano recalled. "Jerry picked up an octopus and said, 'Pete, here's this thing with eight legs. Why don't we throw it on the ice and maybe the Red Wings'll win in eight straight?' I convinced him we should cook it first, make it easier to throw."

That night, Cusimano hid one under his jacket, then slipped it under his seat at the old Olympia Stadium. Just after Howe scored Detroit's first goal, Cusimano hurled the octopus into hockey history.

"The players didn't know what to make of it," Cusimano said. "The linesman skated up. He saw what it was, then just drew right back. Marcel Pronovost began

to beat it with his stick.

The Red Wings swept the Canadiens for the title. A year later, the Red Wings were back in the playoffs and a writer for the old Detroit Times wondered if the octopus would reappear.

"That's where we got the idea to do it again," Cusimano said. "Now, it's gotten to where I think it's done to excess."

Indeed, it's not unusual to see as many as five octopuses scattered around the rink following the national anthem. Cusimano only threw an octopus after the first goal, but today's fans litter the ice during almost any stoppage of play.

The NHL complained mildly early in the playoffs this season. But the Red Wings, who years ago tried to discourage the practice, now have a giant, purple, inflated octopus up among the rafters at Joe Louis Arena.

History of the Stanley Cup

The oldest trophy competed for by professional athletes in North America, was donated by Frederick Arthur, Lord Stanley of Preston and son of the Earl of Derby, in 1892. Lord Stanley purchased the trophy for 10 guineas (\$50 at that time) for presentation to the amateur hockey champions of Canada. Since 1910, when the National Hockey Association took possession of the Stanley Cup, the trophy has been the symbol of professional hockey supremacy. It has been competed for only by NHL teams since 1926 and has been under the exclusive control of the NHL since 1946.

Devils prove they're not 'Mickey Mouse'

DETROIT (AP) — When Wayne Gretzky called the Devils "Mickey Mouse" almost 12 years ago, Paul Coffey said, the NHL's all-time scoring leader really "wasn't jabbing the New Jersey franchise."

Gretzky apologized for the comment, and many years have passed since he made it. But it has been recalled this week as the Devils prepare to play the Detroit Red Wings in the opener of the Stanley Cup finals Saturday night.

"Ron Low was their goaltender and he was our very good friend," said Coffey, now with Detroit but then Gretzky's teammate with the Edmonton Oilers. "We beat them 3-4 and Wayne felt really bad for Ronnie. He was saying that the players quit on their goaltender."

That day — Nov. 19, 1983 — was one of the low points for the Devils, who had just moved to New Jersey after failing in Kansas City and Denver.

NHL notebook

Whatever Gretzky's comment meant, much has changed since.

The Devils are now on the brink of a championship — and possibly another move, this time to Nashville. Gretzky, meanwhile, plays for a Los Angeles Kings team that has missed the playoffs for two straight years.

Besides, being associated with Mickey Mouse is A-O-K in the NHL these days. Just ask the Anaheim Mighty Ducks, the Disney-owned franchise that routinely draws capacity crowds and sells millions of dollars in merchandise.

MONTREAL MEMORIES: Scotty Bowman coached the Montreal Canadiens to five Stanley Cups between 1971 and 1979. One of his best players was Jacques Lemaire, who won eight championships during his Hall of Fame career.

Bowman now coaches the Red Wings. Lemaire now coaches the Devils.

While they offer praise for each other, neither talks easily about the other.

"They kind of had their run as coach and player. I shouldn't say run-ins, but differences," said Larry Robinson, the star defenseman, who played with Lemaire under Bowman and now is Lemaire's assistant coach.

"I'm sure there are a lot of things Scotty did that Jacques didn't agree with, and probably vice versa, and there is probably some admiration there as well."

"We all mellow. I'm sure there were nights he wasn't my favorite man on the ice either as a player. There's always something that happens and you're not happy with the coach, but that in no way lessens the respect."

Familiar faces top U.S. Open leader board

SOUTHAMPTON, N.Y. — Nick Price was his old self. So was Scott Simpson. Greg Norman was better than ever at the U.S. Open.

Price, finally playing again with the near-perfection that won the British Open and PGA last year, grabbed the first-round lead Thursday with a 66 at Shinnecock Hills, a stroke better than Simpson, the Open winner in 1987.

Norman, shooting the best first round in his 14 U.S. Opens, was two strokes back at 68, tied with Phil Mickelson.

"It was a return to great golf for Price, who played so poorly early in the year that he took three weeks off in disgust. It was a return to form at the Open for Simpson, who followed his 1987 victory with four consecutive top-15 finishes.

And it was the best start ever for Norman as he tries to add a U.S. Open to the two British Opens he has won.

"You can play yourself out of the championship in the first round," Norman said. "But you can't win it."

A lot of players put themselves in position to make a move. Twenty-eight players were at par or better going into Friday's second round.

None was better than Price, the guy who walked away from the game

after missing the cut at the Masters and the Houston Open in April.

"There was nothing wrong with my game," said Price. "What was missing was the desire."

"I just wanted someone else to take the heat for a while," Price said. "I got tired of giving 3,000 autographs a day, of answering the same questions over and over again. I just got tired."

On this day, Price was anything but tired. It was he that wore out the formidable Shinnecock layout.

Hitting green after green — 15 on the day — and knocking in nearly all the makeable putts, Price fashioned a five-birdie, one-bogey round, missing a 6-footer for birdie on the last hole that would have tied the course record.

"I felt like I shot a course record anyway," Price said. "If you break 70 on this course, you've played your tail off."

He will have to continue to play his tail off to stay in front. A ton of players are within striking distance.

Jeff Maggert, Fuzzy Zoeller, Bill Glasson, Steve Lowery, Jumbo Ozaki and Bob Tway were three strokes back at 69. Tom Watson, Tom Kite, Curtis Strange and Chris Tidland of Oklahoma State, were in a large group at even-par, 70.

DETROIT (AP) — Detroit took advantage of rookie Brian Boehringer's wildness and Cecil Fielder hit his 14th homer as the Tigers beat the New York Yankees 9-2 Thursday night.

Boehringer (0-1), making his first major league start, walked seven in four-plus innings. Five of the walks figured in the scoring.

Chris Gomez homered and rookie Todd Stevenson had his first three-hit game for the Tigers, who gained a split of the four-game series. Sean Bergman (3-4) won his second straight start, giving up five hits in seven innings.

The Tigers used three singles and a pair of walks to take a 2-0 lead in the second, with Gomez getting an RBI single and Chad Curtis drawing a bases-loaded walk.

Fielder's homer, his first since June 3, made it 3-0 in the third.

Boehringer was removed after walking the bases loaded to start the fifth. Jorges Manzanillo came in and retired the next two batters, but Stevenson lined a two-run single to center.

CHICAGO (AP) — Frank Castillo lost his bid for a perfect game as Mike Benjamin's one-out single in the seventh inning Thursday as the Chicago Cubs beat the San Francisco Giants 3-1.

Castillo (5-2) retired the first 19 batters, striking out the side in the fifth, and walked four hits and one out in eight innings. He struck out 10; tying a career-high he set against the Giants in 1991.

With one out in the seventh, Benjamin hit a clean, line-drive single that bounced once and went past second baseman Rey Sanchez into center field.

Benjamin was 6-for-7 Wednesday with the game-winning RBI in the 13th inning and set a major league record with 14 hits in three straight games: His year-1 debut Thursday.

Castillo, 3-1 in his last seven starts, lost his shutout when he walked Glennallen Hill and Mark Carreon hit an RBI single. That cut Chicago's lead to 2-1.

National League

Pirates 11, Dodgers 7 — Carlos Garcia, who had only 11 RBIs all season, drove in six with a three-run homer and a bases-loaded double to lead the Pittsburgh Pirates past the Los Angeles Dodgers 11-7 Thursday night.

Mark Johnson added a three-run homer as Pittsburgh salvaged the final game of the three-game series behind Denny Neagle (6-3).

Neagle had pitched 12 shutout innings against Los Angeles until a pair of Pirates' errors — their first in 48 innings — and Tim Wallace's two-run double made it 8-4 in the sixth. Raul Mondesi hit his 11th homer in the Los Angeles ninth.

Mets 5, Marlins 4, 10 innings — NEW YORK — Joe Caskie grounded an RBI single up the middle Thursday night, capping New York's 5-4 victory over the Florida Marlins in a game the Mets probably thought they should have won in the ninth.

The Mets scored three runs in the ninth-to tie the game, but it went into extra innings after a disputed double-play call.

In the 10th, though, Todd Hundley and Ryan Thompson drew walks from Randy Venet (2-2).

Caskie, who entered the game as a pinch-hitter in the ninth and hit an RBI single, then delivered the winning hit on a 1-1 pitch. Pinch-runner Tim Lincecum beat a bounding throw home by center fielder Chuck Carr.

Phillies 4, Astros 2 — Phil Adair hit a pinch-hit, two-run home run in the eighth inning as the Phillies beat the Houston Astros 4-2 Thursday night.

Longtime hit a three-run homer with two outs in the ninth inning Thursday night, rallying the Philadelphia Phillies past the Houston Astros 4-2.

Nomo attains 'higher station' in a hurry

PITTSBURGH (AP) — It wasn't the money, the opportunity or the desire to eat hotel-room-service food for six months. No, Hideo Nomo insists he came to the United States for only one reason.

To play baseball against the best — or, as the Japanese are fond of saying, to reach a higher station. To be the best against the best.

But after winning three straight starts and dominating Pittsburgh like no other pitcher in 10 years, Nomo must be wondering where the better competition truly lies — in the majors or back home in Japan.

Again dispelling the myth that his quirky, one-of-a-kind delivery enhances only average major league pitches, Nomo struck out a National League season-high 16 as the Los Angeles Dodgers beat Pittsburgh 8-5 Wednesday.

Afterward, the Pirates searched as frantically for adjectives to describe Nomo as they did earlier for base hits. In two starts against them, Nomo has a 1.20 ERA and 30 strikeouts in 15 innings — a remarkable average of two per inning. He struck out 14 Pirates over seven innings on May 17 in Los Angeles.

"I'd rather face Randy Johnson than Nomo, and I never even faced Johnson before," Al Martin said. "So that tells you what I think of Nomo. Everything he does makes you look real ugly."

The 16 strikeouts broke Karl Spooner's 41-year-old Dodgers' rookie record of 15, and were the most against Pittsburgh since the Mets' Doc Gooden also had 16 in 1984.

So far, the Pirates have looked simply hideous against Hideo, but so have many NL hitters. The right-hander with the funky pause at the start of his now-you-see-me, now-you-don't delivery leads the league with 75 strikeouts in 57 innings, and only Seattle's Johnson and Kansas City's Kevin Appier have more in the AL.

Nomo, 26, pulls on the same blue-and-white Dodgers uniforms once worn proudly by Sandy Koufax, Don Drysdale and Don Newcombe, but, asked to compare his to another star pitcher, the Pirates' Jay Bell offered only: "Cy Young, maybe?"

Of course, a lot of pitchers resemble Young or Walter Johnson against hitting-poor Pittsburgh, and

Nomo acknowledged he hadn't heard of any of these mostly anonymous Pirates before coming to the United States.

Still, Nomo is much too respectful of his new surroundings to speculate whether Japanese baseball is closer to his tastes than major league Americans might think.

Last year, Nomo was 5-4 with the Kintetsu Buffaloes of the Japanese Pacific League; in his last five starts here, he is 3-1 with a 2.09 ERA.

"Every time I go to the mound, no matter what team I am facing, I am feeling more comfortable," Nomo said. "I am seeing teams for the second time, and that helps. I am very relaxed and very comfortable. I am getting used to the major leagues."

But will the majors get used to Nomo?

In his last three starts against the Pirates, Mets and Expos, Nomo is 3-0 with a 1.58 ERA, pretty much stifling the speculation that hitters would quickly adjust to his unorthodox, Luis Tiant-like delivery on his second time around.

"We keep hearing how he's wild, wild, wild," Mark Parent said. "But this guy can paint a corner as well as anyone in the game."

And his forkball? It's the best in the game.

Maybe that recent Japanese newspaper headline was correct: "Nomo on His Way to All-Star Game."

Nomo isn't there yet, but he's well past those early stages when "The Tornado" was considered more a curiosity piece than a first-class pitcher.

"If I were a writer, I'd quit writing about his delivery," Bell said. "He's a good pitcher because he's got good stuff, not because of some trick. The guy is good."
