Batt offers final deal on waste

State would allow 1,000 shipments if all material removed by 2035

BOISE — Gov. Phil Batt on Thursday agreed to permit nearly 1,000 shipments of high level nuclear waste to be dumped in Idaho over the next 40 years if the federal government agrees to move all radioactive material from the state by 2035.

And the Republican governor, flanked by his predecessor Democrat Cecil Andrus, gave the Energy Department and the nuclear Navy until midday Tuesday, to accept or reject

what he termed "our final best offer."

"If they don't accept the offer, we will be back in court fighting vigorously against any new shipments," Batt said.

Andrus, who began the confrontation with the federal government over waste storage at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory in

1988, endorsed the deal in what he said was an effort "to take it out of politics and put it in the realm of what is right and good for Idaho."

"They Navy and DOE will be making a serious mistake if they don't accept it," Andrus said.

The government had proposed dumping another 165 tons of highly radioactive material — 1,940 shipments — in Idaho over the next four decades on top of the 261 tons already stored at the INEL. Batt's deal, to be enforced by the federal

court, restricts new dumping to 97 tons — 968 shipments — in that period and guarantees the eventual removal of all waste.

The offer, detailed in an 11-page settlement agreement, limits the number of shipments the government can dump at INEL each year and imposes a \$100,000-a-day fine, adjusted for inflation, to begin on Jan. 1, 2036, if any radioactive material is still stored at the INEL.

Songs of Ecuador join chorus of moos

FILER — Country music always has been popular at the Twin Falls County Fair and Rodeo, and this year "country music" includes tunes from the country of Ecuador.

Atahualpa, an acoustic band from Otavalo, Ecuador, will perform on the fair's free stage through Monday. The ensemble consists of four South American-Indians — three brothers and a cousin — with an unusual collection of instruments.

"They play traditional folk music from Ecuador, Peru and Bolivia — songs of love, political protest, and reverence for life in the Andes Mountains. The region was at the heart of Inca culture, and the band's name honors the last Inca king. They will perform on the free stage at 1 p.m. today. Showtime on Saturday, Sunday and Monday will be 3 p.m.

The band is non-traditional by southern Idaho standards, but the musicians were warmly applauded between songs Thursday.

"It's different, but I like it," declared Marvin Custer, a Twin Falls resident who stopped to listen. "They don't play too loud, which is good because I don't like loud music."

About 50 others sat on wooden benches near the fair office, enjoying the extolled sounds of the quena (straight flute), the zampona (pan flute), and the charango — a South American version of the mandolin, typically made from the hollowed-out body of an amadillo.

A cow-skin drum provided rhythmic bass, while a rattle made from llama toenails added tonal texture.

The instruments, in the hands of four long-haired men from another continent, prompted more than one fair-goer to do a double-take; some cowhands stared like they was lookin' at a mirage.

Much of the music — particularly from the zampona — is haunting and soulful, but the mood is lightened by the sprightly charango. CDs and cassette tapes of the band's music are available for sale at each performance.

The musicians arrived in the United States in May and will tour through September, said Rodrigo Espinoza, the band's frontman. They were booked to play in Filer by their agent in Portland, Ore. From here, they will move on to the Eastern Idaho State Fair in Blackfoot.

They also have toured extensively in Europe, Espinoza said.

Judge decides jury can hear N-word twice

LOS ANGELES — In a major blow to the defense in the final days of its case, O.J. Simpson's judge ruled Thursday that jurors can hear just two of 41 instances in which Detective Mark Fuhrman uses a racial epithet for blacks.

Superior Court Judge Lance Ito ruled the defense can play two excerpts for jurors in which Fuhrman says the word "nigger." Fuhrman testified earlier at Simpson's murder trial that he hadn't used the word in the past decade. The tapes were made from 1985 to 1994.

But the judge barred the defense from

offering any statements Fuhrman made about police misconduct, mostly on grounds the statements are too inflammatory and the defense had failed to prove the incidents actually happened.

Ito also refused to let the defense play statements in which Fuhrman describes himself as a "key witness in the biggest case of the century" or in which he calls defense attorney Robert Shapiro an "expensive nigger" in a disparaging manner 41 times

during the interviews.

But he said only two excerpts from the tapes can be played for the jurors. In one of them, Fuhrman says, "We have no niggers where I grew up."

In the second, McKinny asks, "Why do they live in that area?"

Fuhrman responds: "That's where niggers live."
Ito rejected the 39 other examples offered by the defense.

the jury should hear evidence that relates to Fuhrman's credibility as a witness.

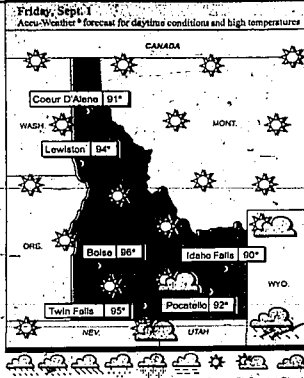
"Just as a defendant with prior felony convictions testifying before a jury is not entitled to a false aura of credibility, neither is Fuhrman," Ito wrote in a 10-page ruling.

"The specific racial epithet at issue is perhaps the single most insulting, inflammatory and provocative term in use in modern day America."

"The court's examination of each of these 41 uses reveals not only the racial epithet itself, but a context not only adds to the insulting and inflammatory nature," Ito wrote.

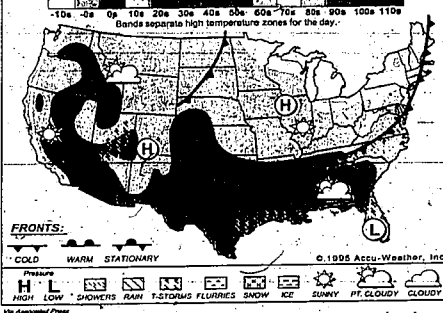

Here are details of Idaho's offer

BOISE (AP) — Here are the terms of the offer Gov. Phil Batt has made to the federal government for voluntary resumption of nuclear dumping at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

WASTE SHIPMENTS
Idaho will accept all 575 waste shipments from the nuclear Navy and another 393 shipments of non-military government waste through 2035.

Only 24 Navy shipments can be made in 1995, 36 in 1996 and 20 a year after that.

The Energy Department would be allowed to make 40 shipments of waste from foreign research reactors through 1998. Those shipments involve material from reactors in Slovenia and Rumania, according to administration. No shipments would be allowed in 1999 and after that shipments of non-military waste would be limited to 20 that material is not met, all other waste shipments would immediately stop.

All high-level waste now submerged in water for storage must be moved to dry storage facilities by the end of 2015. Construction of those facilities must be completed by the end of 2002.

Development of special waste storage canisters must be environmentally tested by April 30, 1999.

\$250 million must be provided the Department of Energy and \$40 million to the Navy over the next five years in addition to the cost of cleanup spent on waste cleanup at the INEL, to pay for the accelerated cleanup.

ENFORCEMENT
In addition to fines if waste is still stored at the INEL in 2035, federal officials that included two face-to-face sessions between Batt and federal brass.

Jerry soaks Florida again, regains strength in Gulf of Mexico

Showers and thundershowers lingered in the Plains on Thursday, while the remnants of Tropical Storm Jerry soaked Florida.

An estimated 1,000 people may be out of their homes for more than a month due to the heavy rain and flooding Jerry brought to the southwest Florida town of Bonita Springs.

Up to 16 inches of rain fell when Jerry crossed Florida for the first time last week. Remnants of the tropical storm have continued to pelt Central and South Florida, and swollen rivers flowing south flooded low-lying neighborhoods in the Bonita Springs area this week.

On Thursday, 3 to 4 inches of rain fell in an hour in Florida's Pasco County, where witnesses reported a tornado sheared the roofs off two apartment complexes, said Michele Baker, director of the county's emergency office. No one was injured.

NATO keeps up strikes

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina (AP) — NATO jets struck at Bosnian Serb ammunition dumps around Sarajevo early today.

It was the third straight day of airstrikes intended to punish the rebels for shelling civilians and push them toward a negotiated peace.

The heavy pounding appeared to be working to cool Serb defiance.

The rebels began pulling some tanks away from Sarajevo, the city they have held in a stranglehold since the Bosnian war began in 1992.

And a U.S. envoy pushing a peace plan reported a breakthrough late Thursday: Both sides now agreed to a division of the country that would give the Serbs less than half. But the tough job of actually drawing the map remained.

NATO said the bombing raids resumed at 2 a.m. (6 p.m. MDT). "The operation is still going on, mostly reconnaissance flights, but we are dropping some bombs," said Capt. Jim Mitchell, a NATO spokesman in Naples, Italy.

Heavy cloud cover Thursday prevented many raids from being carried out. But the skies cleared after midnight and NATO sources, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the jets were going back in to finish the job they had started.

NATO and the United Nations began their aggressive new strategy on Wednesday, flying more than 300 sorties the first day to take out Serb air defenses, artillery and other military targets.

Thursday's sorties — more than 130, according to NATO sources — targeted Serb ammunition storage sites in three different areas around Sarajevo, some of which had also been targeted Wednesday.

Sources in Pale, the Bosnian Serb headquarters southeast of Sarajevo, told The Associated Press that an

Reinke said the county will be negotiating with the local office of the Division of Environmental Quality to use a metal cover, layers of foam or shredded newspaper instead, he said.

Schultz said the district's composting program, which sells 80-gallon composting units to homeowners, is tailored to small-acreage urban and suburban residences.

Each unit can potentially divert 1,200-1,500 pounds of trash — yard trim and kitchen waste — from the trucks headed to a landfill each year.

Even though most landowners aren't using the composting units at maximum capacity, Schultz estimated that 35 to 45 percent of the total solid waste volume is being di-

verted from each participating home site during seven months of the year.

Only 2 or 3 percent of the district's 33,000 home sites, however, are actually composting, he said. Right now, 1,750 composting bins are in use, and Schultz hopes to add 1,000 to the system each year.

He said he thinks the program would have "significant impact" on rubbish volume if extended to Twin Falls city.

Voters face turbulent times from coast to coast

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — These eight are special. In turbulent economic times, they are among the finest Birmingham Southern College has to offer. And in turbulent political times, when many in their generation favor apathy over activism, they are eager to get to work — teaching, social work, some in politics.

"Yet for all this idealism, something is sadly missing: They have no political heroes.

"I can't think of one," says Louisa Carlike, a political science and writing major. "I don't have any," says Jason Phyan, a recent political science graduate. "It just seems foreign to me that a president could actually inspire people," says Michelle Bowen, a 1994 graduate training for social work.

In their lives, nothing much good has been said of government, either in Washington or the state capital in Montgomery all eight consider corrupt and tied to the state's education crisis.

Their sense that the system is rigged against them extends far beyond politics.

"We are resentful in the work force by middle-aged people already feeling the pressure of competition and downsizing," says Phyan. "There is no way I am going to be where my parents are economically."

"And what about OUR kids?" says Bowen. "Are they going to make less and have less than we are? I think our country is in a very scary situation."

SPRINGFIELD, Mo.: Abortion politics

New resorts are changing the character of the Ozarks and the surrounding plateau but more often than not the towns are still anchored along the old railroad tracks.

After years on the defensive, anti-abortion forces are making gains in the new Republican Congress. With little fanfare, this momentum has extended to the states: eight adopted new abortion restrictions this year.

Plemons is determined to make Missouri the ninth. In September, the legislature will try to override the governor's veto of a measure requiring women to receive counseling before an abortion.

His work highlights not only the evolution of political organizing but another critical transformation: a growing acceptance of incremental gains, such as ending federal funding of abortions or requiring parental notification.

"Many used to consider it immoral to accept anything short of outlawing abortion," says Mary Kay Culp, the Missouri Right to Life president. "My view is that you can't throw a touchdown pass if there is nobody in the end zone to catch it. So why not stick to a steady ground game and see if you can't win more fans over along the way?"

"It just took the wind out of my lungs," Ciseon says. "We worked so hard and it was just so casual how the judges disregarded the will of the people. But we will not quit."

Neither will Alan Armijo.

"I have never believed in term limits," said Armijo, a second-term councilman. "The people have a chance to get rid of politicians in elections."

Armijo is undaunted by the 71 percent who backed term limits. "It is an important principle to defend."

TUSTIN, Calif.: Partners in anxiety

Voting Republican is a big tradition here in the wealthy Pacific hills of Orange County, one Karin Reynolds used to proudly defy.

Not any more.

Over the past three years, she has switched from Democrat to independent to Republican, changes born of the challenges of raising three children while working as a physical therapist and watching her husband struggle to get a small business into the black.

She and her husband both have advanced degrees, yet voice the same economic strain — and resentment — of Randy Payton, the service station man encountered 3,000 miles ago in rural Georgia.

Work, schools, soccer games, dinner, sleep, work. It is an exhausting cycle that, for all the talk about angry white males, has made Reynolds and warring women like her perhaps the electorate's most volatile voters.

These emotions drove her away from Democrats who "think every body deserves a free ride," Independent Ross Perot benefited in 1992; Republicans in 1994.

But the GOP isn't guaranteed her vote in 1996.

Or her husband's.

A "small-business fiscal conservatism," Ed Reynolds owns an environmental engineering firm that finally got some traction last year.

No thanks, in his view, to the government.

FBI's watchful eye over ammo store frightens clients

KINGMAN, Ariz. (AP) — At Archie's Bunker, the bookstall was a militia man's dream.

There's "Ammo Forever." A variety of manuals explaining how to operate military ordnance. And one copy of "Unconventional Warfare Devices and Techniques."

But, Valerie Hilton laments, there aren't many buyers. "You see, we are still under surveillance."

The military surplus store, operated for the past eight months by Hilton and her husband, George, was a favorite of Michael Fortier, who has admitted he knew of plans to bomb the Oklahoma City federal building. The FBI believes chief bombing suspect Timothy McVeigh shopped at Archie's too.

As a result, suspected FBI surveillance is scurrying away local militia types and other gun enthusiasts who once bought fatigues and other supplies at Archie's.

So Hilton is moving the store, off the beaten track, hoping the

locals will return.

"They don't want to be photographed coming in here," Hilton said. "People have become paranoid."

But by no means willing to give up their guns.

"People in Arizona are free thinkers," she said. "You are not going to take my rights away."

That sentiment runs deep among visitors to Steve Rusiecki's gun shop in nearby Bullhead City.

Its specialty: certifying people who want to carry concealed handguns, legal under a year-old Arizona law. Rusiecki has certified 800 people; more than 28,000 permits were issued statewide.

The bombing — and subsequent focus on militias — is a major reason momentum has stalled in Congress. But it hasn't hurt Rusiecki's business. "The politicians always overreact," he says. "Guns and independence are part of our tradition here."

"I keep losing bids to less qualified minority firms," he says. And when he finally landed one, Orange County filed for bankruptcy protection, leaving Reynolds in the lurch to the tune of \$50,000.

The Roman Catholic family attends church regularly and says grace before meals. God is welcome in the Reynolds' home, but not in their politics.

"The religious right scares me to death," Ed Reynolds says.

So he, too, is no predictable vote these days. Across America, the Reynolds and many suburban people like them are the biggest commodity in a new politics: born of a reassessment of so much of what had become so accepted.

Economics. Race. Illegal immigration. Crime. Declining values. These

often overlapping issues blend into powerful emotions, which in turn compete with the inherent optimism that so many people are determined to surrender. The result is an anxious nation, in unpredictable economic and political turmoil.

"We work our tails off to make it work," Karin Reynolds says, venting the frustration of a nation.

"We have to buy insurance. We have to pay taxes. And someone else gets health care and services and pays no taxes because they are in this country illegally. How is that fair?"

"Someone who doesn't work and has more babies gets more welfare. How is that fair? ... There has to be some financial accountability, and some moral accountability."

A few sky scrapers compete with the adobe and Indian structures that give Albuquerque its tranquil character. And just as this historic city is not immune to growth, neither can it, escape political unrest.

Liz Taylor, husband No. 7 separate

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. — Elizabeth Taylor says she and husband No. 7 Larry Fortensky "need our own space for a while" and are splitting up, four years after their lavish wedding at Michael Jackson's ranch. "We have agreed to a trial separation. We both hope this is only temporary," Miss Taylor said in a statement Tuesday. The 63-year-old violet-eyed actress told syndicated columnist Liz Smith: "I feel sad, I sincerely hope it will work out. ... But Larry and I need to work on things."

Fortensky, 43, was a twice-divorced construction worker when he met Miss Taylor in 1988 at the Betty Ford Clinic, where they were treated for substance abuse. They were married Oct. 6, 1991, at Jackson's Neverland Ranch.

Study: Heart drug can increase death rate

NEW YORK — Patients taking high doses of one of the heart drugs known as calcium channel blockers had nearly triple the death rate of others with heart disease, a new study shows.

In a separate study published last week, the same drug was linked to a 60 percent increase in heart attack risk.

Calcium channel blockers have been used to treat heart attacks and chest pain, but they are now most widely used to treat high blood pressure. Researchers are divided over the implications of the two studies. Some agree with the drugs' makers that newer, more widely used versions of the medicines are safer.

Celebrities help in rescue of man

SANTA MONICA, Calif. — Michael Jackson's plastic surgeon jumped into the ocean to save a suicidal man early Thursday as Hollywood Madam Heidi Fleiss called 911 for help.

An unidentified 40-year-old man handcuffed himself and jumped off a pier just after midnight in this coastal city west of Los Angeles, police Sgt. Gary Gallinat said.

Dr. Steve Hoefflin, Jackson's surgeon, leaped in after him and kept the man afloat, Gallinat said.

Fleiss and Dr. Bruce Hensel, a reporter with KNBC-TV, called police. The department keeps a rescue boat at the pier and officers were able to pull both men to safety, Gallinat said.

Fuel cell adds to shuttle launch delay

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — Space shuttle Endeavour's science mission, already delayed by 23 days, was put off for another week Thursday when an electricity-generating unit overheated hours before liftoff.

NASA said the problem was probably caused by a stuck valve in one of the shuttle's three fuel cells, which burn liquid hydrogen and oxygen to generate electricity used by the spacecraft throughout a flight.

The 255-pound cells are so critical that the failure of even one in orbit would force NASA to order a shuttle back to Earth as soon as possible.

Endeavour had not yet been fueled and the five astronauts had not yet boarded when the launch was scrubbed with 7 1/2 hours to go. Thunderstorms probably would have delayed liftoff even if everything had worked properly.

DNA proves Czar Nicholas' identity

WASHINGTON — American and Russian experts said Thursday they've resolved the last shred of doubt: A DNA test "unambiguously confirms" that bones unearthed from a mass grave in Russia in 1991 are those of Nicholas II, last of the czars of all the Russias.

If the evidence is accepted by church and state officials in Russia, Nicholas, murdered in a cellar with his family and servants by the revolutionary Bolsheviks one bloody night in 1918, can be given the ceremonial burial that was held up while the investigation was conducted.

"A great murder mystery spanning most of the decade is solved," Lt. Col. Victor W. Weeden, who runs the DNA laboratory for the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, told a news conference, reporting on a three-month investigation conducted jointly with Russia's foremost DNA scientist, Pavel Ivanov.

FDA: MSG safe for almost everyone.

WASHINGTON — Although many people say they get sick from MSG, the flavor enhancer in Chinese food, the government concludes Thursday that it's safe for almost everyone and causes only mild, temporary reactions in a few people.

Scientific advisers to the Food and Drug Administration couldn't determine just who would experience these reactions — generally headaches and numbness or tingling — but said some asthma patients may be more susceptible.

The report by the panel also declared that there is no scientific evidence that any "free glutamate," the chemical family to which MSG belongs, causes or exacerbates severe diseases.

Gene may protect from breast cancer

NEW YORK — Pregnancy kicks an anti-cancer gene into high gear in the breasts of mice, a study says, offering a possible clue to why women run a lower risk of breast cancer if they give birth early in life.

If that notion is correct, it might lead to a risk-lowering treatment for women in general.

Studies show that women who give birth at age 18 run about one-half to one-third the lifetime breast cancer risk of childless women, said researcher Lewis C. Chen of the University of Pennsylvania, School of Medicine. The benefit declines the longer a woman waits to have a baby, and by age 30 it is gone.

Medicare raises rates paid to hospitals 1.5%

WASHINGTON (AP) — Medicare will raise the basic rates it pays hospitals 1.5 percent on Oct. 1, but overall payments to 5,200 hospitals still will climb almost 8 percent in the year ahead, the government said Thursday.

The across-the-board increase is 2 percentage points less than the projected inflation rate in the goods and services that hospitals buy.

Congress and the Clinton administration showed the annual increases as part of a deficit-reduction package enacted in 1993.

The 1.5 percent increase will go to the nation's acute-care, community hospitals that receive fixed, predetermined payments pegged to Medicare patients' diagnoses.

Some 3,350 other specialized hospitals — including psychiatric, re-

habilitation, long-term and children's facilities — will get a 2.4 percent increase, or 1 percentage point less than their projected inflation rate. They are paid a different way.

"These increases will fairly compensate the nation's hospitals, while at the same time encouraging them to reduce the rate of inflation in health care costs," Health and Human Services Secretary Donna E. Shalala said.

Medicare, which covers 37 million elderly or disabled Americans, paid \$81 billion to hospitals for acute care in fiscal 1994 and is spending almost \$87 billion this year. It expects the hospital payments to rise to nearly \$94 billion in fiscal 1996, which starts Oct. 1.

Bruce C. Vladeck, who runs the Medicare program, said the forces driv-

ing overall hospital payments up an expected 7.7 percent next year include higher hospital admission rates, growth in the ranks of beneficiaries, and the fact that hospitals are admitting people with more serious health problems.

The hospital trust fund is in danger of going broke by 2002.

Congressional Republicans have proposed saving \$270 billion from Medicare over seven years, while President Clinton wants to cut spending by \$124 billion.

The Health Care Financing Administration, in a rule appearing in Friday's Federal Register, also formally eliminated a requirement that physicians sign "attestation statements" certifying each patient's diagnoses and procedures before hospitals could get paid by Medicare.

Phone workers call in sick

WASHINGTON (AP) — "A couple of thousand" workers at Bell Atlantic called in sick Thursday in a lingering dispute between the phone company and a union representing most of its employees.

Jeff Miller, a spokesman for the Communications Workers of America, said the union had not called any such job action and declined further comment.

Bell Atlantic spokesman Eric Rabe said workers called in sick throughout the company's region. But most were in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh.

"Most of the workers who called in sick are installers and repair people," Rabe said. He said the company was having no problem maintaining service and had received no customer complaints. "This is not a crisis. This is not going to make a difference to customer service," Rabe said.

Despite profit surge, workers locked out

WASHINGTON (AP) — Stocks and profits may be surging, but workers have been locked out from a flourishing economy, Labor Secretary Robert Reich said Thursday.

In a Labor Day preview, Reich offered a snapshot of "frayed-collar workers in gold-plated times" and criticized the growing gulf between corporate profits and workers' wages as "terribly un-American."

"The economy has caught fire," he said. "But the gains to most workers have gone up in smoke."

The labor secretary also had harsh words for Republican lawmakers and said the applause that greeted this week's merger of Chemical and Chase Manhattan banks illustrated the plight of American workers.

While shareholders could gain as much as \$2.5 billion from the merger, 12,000 workers could lose their jobs.

"This episode is ... another symptom of the disconnect between the paycheck economy and the paper economy," Reich said. "Jobs disappear and the markets cheer. Now there's something wrong with this picture."

Reich blasted Republican lawmakers who oppose raising the minimum wage from \$4.25 an hour and seek to trim federal college loan programs, but want to boost defense spending and maintain corporate tax loopholes.

Reich promised that President Clinton would veto a federal budget proposal if the Senate includes such "family-slashing" measures.



In his speech at a forum sponsored by an economic research group, Reich said that the workers' lot will not be reversed without an increase in the minimum wage, a reformed labor movement and tough enforcement of labor laws.

39 members of feared gang arrested

CHICAGO (AP) — Thirty-nine reputed leaders and enforcers of a feared street gang were arrested today, and the indictments against them should "severely cripple" the organization, a federal attorney said.

Three separate indictments charge 39 alleged members of the Gangster Disciples with a 25-year conspiracy to distribute cocaine, crack, heroin and marijuana, and to extort protection money from street dealers in Chicago and its suburbs.

Each indictment contains more than 45 additional counts, ranging from narcotics violations to gun offenses.

"For more than two decades, this gang has terrorized entire communi-

ties, preying on young people in particular," U.S. Attorney James Burns said.

About 250 law enforcement officers — including agents from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and Drug Enforcement Administration, Chicago and state police — began rounding up those named in the indictments about 6 a.m., ATF spokesman Jerry Singer said.

U.S. envoy says his peace initiative makes progress

ZAGREB, Croatia (AP) — The U.S. diplomat trying to sell Washington's peace plan for Bosnia spoke Thursday of progress in his talks, yet warned against letting expectations get too high. Assistant Secretary of State Richard Holbrooke was in the Croatian capital to brief Croatian and Bosnian government officials on his talks with Serbian President Slobodan Milosevic, the regional powerbroker who is key to any peace deal. Those talks were followed by the announcement that the Bosnian Serb and Serbian officials, led by Milosevic, would form a joint negotiating team in future peace talks. Holbrooke spoke to reporters before NATO jets struck at Bosnian Serb targets for a second day. He said the planned formation of a joint negotiating team "constitutes a procedural breakthrough, but only a procedural one," and he acknowledged that "tough negotiations lie ahead."

Milosevic and his onetime protégé, Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic, have been feuding for more than a year over when and how to end the Bosnian war, fanned by Milosevic's nationalist rhetoric and dream of a "Greater Serbia." Milosevic is now desperate to have the United Nations lift sanctions imposed three years ago to punish Serb-dominated Yugoslavia for inciting the war and wants the Bosnian Serbs to acquiesce to terms they abhor. Holbrooke briefed Croatian President Franjo Tudjman and Bosnian Foreign Minister Muhamed Sairic on his meeting with Milosevic before returning to Serbia late Thursday for more consultations. "The actual substance of the negotiations remains extremely difficult: the map, the arrangements and so on. And you don't want to create any false optimism," Holbrooke told Associated Press Television in Zagreb. "But it is certainly true that after 16 months of arguing about who speaks for the Serbs, that issue has been resolved and the decks are now cleared for serious negotiations."

Milosevic said after Wednesday's talks that the U.S. plan "creates a real perspective for peace, and has all elements that could guarantee peace and the protection of interests of all the warring sides." "A significant narrowing of differences" was achieved, he said. Milosevic has endorsed the plan to divide Bosnia roughly between the Muslim-Croat federation and rebel Serbs. The plan also includes mutual recognition of Bosnia, Croatia and Yugoslavia, land swaps, constitutional arrangements linking the two parts of Bosnia with Croatia and Serbia, and the resolution of a dispute over a slice of Croatia still in the hands of rebel Serbs there. Holbrooke said he would brief West European leaders about the negotiations over the next few days. Blistering NATO raids Wednesday punishing the Bosnian Serbs for a deadly attack near a Sarajevo market were "entirely justified by the circumstances that caused them," he said. At the same time, "our peace initiative goes forward," he said.

Speech barriers challenged

HUAIROU, China (AP) — Women at a world conference declared themselves able to do anything they set their minds to — and proceeded Thursday to knock down Chinese barriers to free speech. Nobel Prize winner Aung San Suu Kyi, who spent six years under house arrest for fighting for democracy in Burma, set the tone in her videotaped keynote address to the NGO Forum on Women, the largest meeting of women ever. She urged governments to spend less on the war toys of grown men and much more on the urgent needs of humanity as a whole. China had ordered that all demonstrations at the conference be held in a tiny section of the conference grounds and that China be exempt from any criticism. But Amnesty International delegates paraded beyond the limits Thursday with banners and pictures of 11 women political prisoners, including two in China. They circulated a petition calling for the women's release and said they would deliver copies to the government ministers involved. Tibetan women who live in the West showed a videotape of Tibetans forced into exile. Women delegates who came to see the tape grabbed it back from two Chinese who tried to seize it. Throughout it all, Chinese security videotaped and took notes furiously. But only in the case of the Tibetan tape did they attempt to interfere. The gathering has drawn thousands of private activists from around the world who came to China hoping to influence decisions made at the United Nations' Fourth World Conference on Women, which starts Monday. The first working day of the forum was everything China had feared. China insisted the 10-day private forum be held in Huairou, a small town an hour's drive from Beijing, in an attempt to limit contact between the women and ordinary Chinese, who were barred from the site.

Topics vary at conference from O.J. to Algerian women

HUAIROU, China (AP) — In a tent at the world's largest women's gathering, Marnia Lazreg was describing to a silent, appalled audience the horror of being female in Algeria. In another, a more boisterous crowd was attending, "O.J. Simpson: Black Women Speak on Black Men, Violence and Interracial Relationships." They were just two of 300 workshops and seminars Thursday for more than 17,000 women who have come to Huairou, 30 miles from Beijing, to monitor and lobby the U.N. Fourth World Conference on Women. Whether these exchanges have any influence on the official conference opening Monday remains to be seen. But they are, in a sense, the whole point of the Huairou gathering — a chance for the women of the world to share knowledge, form networks, and swap tales from the gender wars. A multiracial group of about 100 women crammed an open air pavilion for the O.J. Simpson debate

organized by Sisterlove, a woman's AIDS support group in Atlanta. It began with a straw poll, in which most of the women said they believed Simpson was guilty of murdering his ex-wife, Nicole, and Ronald Goldman. Most also said they believed he would be acquitted. Rene Emily Dubose of Charlotte, N.C., had heard the tape recording of detective Mark Fuhrman's epithets about blacks on television the night before. It didn't change her belief that Simpson is guilty. "Now that it's verified, it doesn't take away the fact that O.J. murdered that woman," she said to whoops and applause. The topic soon broadened. A Danish woman protested that in the furor over actor Hugh Grant's indiscretion, too little attention was paid to the hardships of women prostitutes. In contrast to the scene at Sisterlove's pavilion, the mood was somber at Professor Lazreg's workshop, where 300 listeners were told of the hundreds of women who have been killed by Muslim extremists.

Russia warned of nuclear catastrophes

MOSCOW (AP) — The potential nuclear disaster that lurks in Russia is especially threatening in Moscow, where scores of reactors are not receiving adequate upkeep and are tended by poorly trained workers, environmental experts warned Thursday. The experts told a news conference that severe nuclear accidents are possible at deteriorating facilities throughout the country. The main danger, they said, is from the country's 160 research reactors, 53 of which are in Moscow. "No one makes any effort to modernize the aging equipment," said Vladimir Kuznetsov, head of the Russian Nuclear Emergency Prevention Center. Many of the research reactors are more than 40 years old. "We also have a nuclear waste storage facility in Moscow with a capacity equaling the amount of radioactivity released in Chernobyl," he said. In April 1986, a reactor at the Chernobyl power plant in Ukraine exploded in the world's worst nuclear disaster, spewing a radioactive cloud across Europe. Kuznetsov, who headed the Moscow branch of the government's nuclear watchdog agency, was fired last year after he accused industry officials of neglecting safety standards.

Idea behind cargo center deserves credit, praise

Whether an "intermodal" cargo center makes economic sense for Twin Falls remains to be seen, but local officials deserve praise and encouragement for trying.

In case you're not familiar with the term, concept (and most people aren't), "intermodal center" is a fancy name for what is really a containerized freight yard: It's a place where cargo containers can be moved from trucks to trains and vice versa.

Such a facility could be a plus for Twin Falls in a number of ways:

- It could help Twin Falls become even more of an economic hub than it already is. We could be a crossroads for all kinds of goods moving in and out of southern Idaho.

- It could help southern Idaho capitalize on the emerging relationship between railroads and their longtime nemesis, the trucking industry. By combining the strengths of both transportation modes, this area could improve its access to domestic and foreign markets for Idaho agricultural goods.

- (One reason this works, is that a container can be moved from a truck to a train, then to a ship, for easy, foreign transport.)

- Putting such a facility east of

town would steer truck traffic toward the Hansen Bridge, and away from the congested Perrine Bridge corridor.

It would allow removal of the downtown switching yard.

That last point is an exciting fringe-benefit. If you drive down Minidoka Avenue, you already can see the beginnings of the Old Towne development. Just east of Shoshone Street, an initial flurry of entrepreneurship has begun. A little imagination suggests a future of charming commercial areas and splendid green spaces, tying downtown Twin Falls to the rim of Rock Creek Canyon — a currently underappreciated community resource.

This potential is hampered by the presence of a spiderweb of train tracks. Moving the switching yard to an intermodal center on the east side of town would be a huge plus for Old Towne.

As attractive as these benefits sound, they are still only dreams. Seeing them become reality depends on economics.

An intermodal center in Twin Falls may or may not be turned out to be a viable venture. We'll see. But if it does, Twin Falls residents have multiple reasons to welcome it.

Suggestion to solve nuclear waste

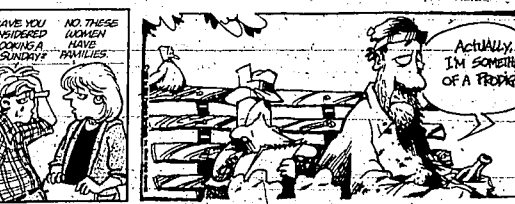

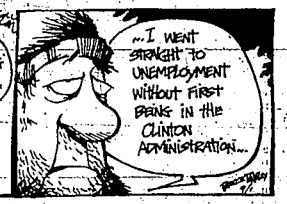

Fellow officers don't recognize LAPD in Fuhrman comments

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Police Sgt. Mario Munoz doesn't know Mark Fuhrman and doesn't want to. "Doesn't understand him, either, and certainly doesn't like him," Munoz says. "Most of us are out there busting our butts. We never use those words. I've been on the job 14 years and I've never heard it. I'm not going to tell you that nobody's said it, but I haven't been around anybody who's said it." Munoz says in the weary tone of a combat survivor.

The word is "nigger," and in tape-recorded interviews Fuhrman gave to a screen-

writer, it rolled easily off his tongue. The hateful remarks and their role in the O.J. Simpson murder trial elicited anger and dismay, especially in the Los Angeles Police Department.

"Terrible, disgraceful, reprehensible," said Dennis Zine, president of the police union. His officers are "very upset. They're saying 'How much more can we take? He's tarnished the entire department.'"

In the LAPD Fuhrman describes; "This job is not rules. This is a feeling. (Expletive) the rules."

And the 77th Division, serving predomi-

nantly black South Central Los Angeles, is permeated by "the smell of niggers that have been beaten and killed," Fuhrman said on the tapes.

He also boasted of beatings and manufacturing evidence, and spewed venomous diatribes against Hispanics and women. Ridiculous, says Munoz. Worse than ridiculous. Stupid.

"It's totally false," Munoz said. "It's like we never get out of the hole. I think officers are tired of being accused and being reprimanded for what other people do. I think the officers in this department are numb."

Having spent seven years in the 77th, Munoz says Fuhrman's characterization of it is yet another lie.

"That's not the 77th, I know. And I'll tell you one thing. That's one place where we were appreciated the most. Seventy-seventh has a very outspoken community. You do something wrong, they'll call the station. They're very sensitive."

Fuhrman's spokesmen have said he made things up to impress the interviewer, Laura Hart McKinay. She testified Tuesday out of the jury's presence that she believed Fuhrman described some actual events.

Munoz now heads the anti-gang unit at the Harbor Division in San Pedro, 25 miles southwest of downtown. Before that, he led a special gang unit at the Pacific Division near Venice Beach, 15 miles west of downtown.

Soft-spoken and conscientious, Munoz is the kind of officer who keeps his head down and works hard, who catnaps in the back of his truck between triple shifts.

"Most of the officers I talk to, they're sick of this. They're tired of being on the defensive. We've been on the defensive now for three years," he said.

Horried, Fuhrman's lawyer quits

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Mark Fuhrman's civil lawyer dropped the retired police detective Tuesday as a client, citing "despicable statements of ignorance and hatred" on tapes played during the O.J. Simpson trial.

"I was profoundly disgusted and horrified by the contents of Mr. Fuhrman's taped conversations," attorney Robert Tourtelot said in a statement. Tourtelot has spoken on Fuhrman's behalf for the past year.

Tourtelot had filed a lawsuit on Fuhrman's behalf against The New Yorker magazine and Simpson attorney Robert Shapiro, saying the detective's reputation was damaged by a report that outlined the defense plan to a t a c k

Fuhrman. Simpson's lawyers have accused Fuhrman of being a racist cop capable of planting evidence in efforts to frame Simpson for the murders of Nicole Brown Simpson and her friend Ronald Goldman on June 12, 1994.

In his statement, Tourtelot said he was quitting as Fuhrman's lawyer for reasons that are "personal but no doubt obvious."

Despite his strong feelings, Tourtelot said he remains convinced Fuhrman did not plant evidence in the Simpson case and that the evidence points to Simpson as the killer.

"I can only hope that these despicable statements of ignorance and hatred do not distract us from the crucial issue of this trial, which is Mr. Simpson's responsibility for the brutal slayings of Ronald Goldman and Nicole Brown Simpson," Tourtelot said.

As late as last week, Tourtelot reaffirmed his representation of Fuhrman in the matter, although the detective hired a criminal lawyer to handle possible charges against him.

"My heart is filled with grief and my thoughts and prayers at this time go out to the many, many people whose lives have been stung by Mr. Fuhrman's comments," Tourtelot said; "as well as the many fine men and women of law enforcement throughout this country who may be wrongly judged as a result of Mr. Fuhrman's statements."

Tourtelot defended his actions on Fuhrman's behalf.

"During this time I have acted to the best of my knowledge and ability in response to what I believed were libelous charges made against Mr. Fuhrman," he said.

"I was profoundly disgusted and horrified by the contents of Mr. Fuhrman's taped conversations, as I listened along with the rest of the world last Tuesday," he added.

Before hearing the tapes, Tourtelot defended Fuhrman publicly, saying he was not a bigot and suggesting Fuhrman was merely role-playing and trying to impress a screenwriter with his macho persona when he did the taped interviews.

Tourtelot's associate, investigator Anthony Pellicano, has said that Fuhrman had a "mental block" about the tapes when he testified that he had not used a racial epithet in the last 10 years.

Today, Pellicano said he was still working for Fuhrman and he wouldn't discuss Tourtelot's decision.

"He's doing this for personal reason that are his. It's very inappropriate for me to comment one way or the other," Pellicano said.

Pellicano said the former detective should tell his side if called to testify again.

"My advice to Mark Fuhrman is to get on the stand and tell the truth. I think he's going to get criticized and lambasted. At least he can walk away from the stand with dignity," Pellicano said.

"If he gets up there and says, 'Listen, I'm sorry, I'm sorry that this apparently put this major sport bump in the trial. Hate me if you want to. But I didn't know about planting that glove,'" Pellicano said.



No court date set yet for activist Chisholm

BUHL - Environmental activist Bill Chisholm will not go before a judge next week to explain his unusual style of restitution for throwing red paint on a train carrying radioactive waste into Idaho.

No new court date has been set by officials in the 6th Judicial District.

Last month, Chisholm was ordered to appear on Sept. 5 in Magistrate Court in Pocatello for alleged failure to pay restitution. In March, a judge ordered Chisholm to pay a \$300 fine and \$1,782 restitution to remove a small amount of paint.

Chisholm threw the paint from a Pocatello railroad overpass in the wee hours of Oct. 23, 1992. He said he had paid the fine and \$200 restitution, which he said is a reasonable amount for cleaning up 54 worth of paint.

Chisholm also maintains he has paid the balance of the restitution - with a cashier's check made out to himself, Idaho Gov. Phil Batt, and Bannock County.

He said he will endorse the check only if five anti-nuke conditions are met; the check has not been cashed.

Winning drafts

Jerome cowboy draws on years of experience to win event

FILER - Vernon Miller isn't a big man and, at 80, isn't as strong as he once was - but he can guide the biggest horses through the subtlest maneuvers with amazing control.

Miller, of Jerome, proved his prowess with draft horses Thursday at the Twin Falls County Fair. The draft horse competition opened with a "performance driving class" - which Miller won going away.

Seated atop a beautiful wagon, Miller worked his two big horses like an orchestra conductor. Wagon and team weaved precisely through an obstacle

course in the rodeo arena, then completed an intricate backing maneuver around a 90-degree bend to win the event.

For many spectators, working with draft horses is almost a lost art. "This is kind of nostalgic," said Scott Cannedy, who sat in the stands. "I grew up around here and saw horses doing this kind of work when I was a kid."

"Diesel fuel has put an end to that," he said, shaking his head wistfully. "For some of these old-boys, this is a labor of love."

The performance driving class was one of more than a dozen events in the draft horse competition. It pitted six wagons and teams against a scattered collection of orange highway cones.

The wagon drivers, to a man, wore white straw hats, thick gloves and no-nonsense expressions.

About 150 spectators watched the obstacle course event, then feasted their eyes on the sight of non-motorized farm machinery being pulled around the ring. The day's events reached a crescendo with a lively log-pulling contest against the clock.

Jim Miller, Vernon's son, stood outside the arena and watched his dad with obvious pride.

"He might not be very big, but his horses definitely know who's boss," the younger Miller remarked. He watched

Officials target clothes, 'colors,' to keep fairgrounds free of gangs

TWIN FALLS - Fair workers and sheriff's deputies took refresher courses this year on what to do in case gangs of youths cause trouble at the Twin Falls County Fair and Rodeo.

"We want everybody to come to a fair and have a good time, but don't come to the fair and be a gang member," said Lt. Bob Gauthier of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department.

Idaho's anti-gang law allows police to question a group of people if any one of them has a criminal record, Gauthier said.

Anyone wearing bandannas or other clothing that appears to have gang "colors" will be asked to change clothes or leave the fair, said Chief Deputy Ed Gudgeff. Weapons are forbidden on anyone, he added.

"It seems like when gangs are in one area and flying their colors, it shows their turf so to speak," Gudgeff said. "It causes a little tension that doesn't need to be there."

"We've been fortunate in the past," Gudgeff added. "When they walk through the gate we approach them right away, let them know what we expect of them. We kind of nip it before it ever gets started."

Gangs have a tendency to steal and fight each other - but most of the problems at the fair have been minor since they became more obvious two years ago "enough to hassle the decent people who are there to have fun," Gauthier said.

Gang members are not the only people who cause problems. Once authorities arrested a woman who had opened a booth selling jewelry - all of it stolen, Gauthier said. Other times, police have caught sellers hawking counterfeit Latino music, he said.

"People should guard their purses and wallets against thieves, he warned.

"Like anyone, gang members are allowed to come to the fair to have a good time, but will be arrested or evicted if they cause problems, Gudgeff said. About 25 deputies will patrol the fair grounds, he said.

"Fortunately we haven't had much trouble," Gudgeff said. "The more security that is visible the less problems we have."

High court rebuffs water groups

BOISE - The Idaho Supreme Court has refused to change a ruling that denied four conservation groups permission to intervene in the Snake River Basin water rights case to protect the public interest.

Nearly 14 months ago, the court overturned a district court ruling allowing the conservation groups to intervene on a limited basis. The Snake River Basin Adjudication is a court effort to sort out more than 150,000 Snake River water rights.

As it did then, the Supreme Court on Thursday ruled that the Idaho Conservation League, Idaho Rivers United, Idaho Wildlife Federation and the Northwest Resource Information Center have no standing to press claims to protect the public interest in the water case. After affirming the Supreme Court ruled unanimously to keep it to its earlier ruling.

In another decision released Thursday, the court refused for the second time in a week to apply state workers compensation law to farmers. Robin Riggs was killed in 1990 while operating a hay baler for Cyrus Standlee, doing business as Standlee Alfalfa Farms of Glenns Ferry. His surviving spouse, Cynthia Riggs, filed a claim for workers compensation death benefits.

The Industrial Commission denied the claim, finding that Standlee qualified under the state exemption for farmers from the law requiring all other businesses to provide workers compensation insurance.

The widow's appeal claimed that since Standlee's primary occupation was buying and shipping alfalfa, that didn't qualify for the agriculture exemption.

The Supreme Court agreed with the Industrial Commission that Standlee was an alfalfa farmer and his business activities were those ordinarily done by farmers, except perhaps on a larger scale. The court last week made a similar ruling on a claim filed by a farm worker who was repairing farm machinery when he was injured.

The Industrial Commission upheld all benefits to Lynn Livingston, who was injured while repressing a hay baler for Ireland Bank. The court agreed that Livingston was an alfalfa farmer at the time of the accident, not a bank employee.

Photographer sends Eden into a tizzy

EDEN - It started innocently: On Aug. 24, Times-News photographer snapped pictures of children leaving a yellow bus as the newspaper prepared an article about back-to-school safety.

But concerned Eden residents reacted in dramatic fashion.

For about a week, no one in this town of 314 residents seemed to know why anyone would want to take pictures of their children.

Some families boycotted school buses and drove their children to school. Other people armed themselves with weapons, according to Jerome County Sheriff's Lt. Gerald Brant.

"It wasn't just a couple of older women getting all paranoid because a car went down the road," said Jim Taylor, a 53-year-old farmer. "It got out of hand."

In an attempt to discover the photographer's identity, one resident hired a private investigator, who was promptly questioned by a flurry of police last Friday for lurking around a school bus, armed with binoculars and a camera.

People saw the increased police presence, and rumors spread among residents "like a brush fire with a 50 mph wind behind it," Taylor said. "It just kept getting worse and worse and worse."

"When your child becomes involved, first you react, then common sense kicks in later," said Taylor, whose two children were escorted to the bus for the past week of a comedy of errors, he said.

The school had few answers. People were scared. After learning the full truth from the Jerome County Sheriff's Department Wednesday, Taylor went to *The Times-News*.

Photographer Buddy Mangine said he contacted a Valley School District secretary by telephone before he took the pictures. Bus drivers were not told, however. Schools Superintendent Arlyn Bodily said he didn't think anyone had been notified.

Said *Times-News* Managing Editor Clark Walworth: "We were surprised to hear about this problem, and we're very sorry for the anxiety it caused the parents. "I don't think Mr. Mangine did anything inappropriate, but obviously the circumstances combined to cause a problem that we don't want to see repeated. I will be reminding all of our staff members to be sensitive about letting people know who we are and what we're doing."

Clinton meets with Idaho Dems

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — About 50 Idaho Democrats got a chance to meet with President Bill Clinton and his family, and party officials say they tried to give rank-and-file workers a chance to visit with the Clintons.

The half-hour event Thursday morning at the Idaho Falls Airport was a hastily arranged session. Cathy Fuller, party executive director, said since the Clintons have been vacationing in Wyoming, they wanted a chance to meet with him.

It wasn't approved by the White House until Wednesday, setting off a scramble to get on the invita-

tion list. "Once the word gets out, there's a lot of people who'd like to meet him," she said.

Fuller said party leaders decided it would be a good opportunity to give workers and volunteers a chance to meet the Clintons. She said "worker bees and contributors—those kind of folks" were among those invited.

On hand to greet the president besides Fuller were former Congressman Richard Stallings; Edith Stanger, former Bonneville County commissioner who ran for secretary of state last year and Brent Bell, Madison County Democratic chairman.

"I really feel privileged and excited to be invited from this part of the state to meet with him," Bell said.

"This president hasn't written off Idaho, the most Republican state in the Union," said Fred Hoopes, chairman of Bonneville County Democrats.

Eight Air Force Special Police officers from Hill Air Force Base in Utah were detailed to Idaho Falls to help guard Air Force One and its backup plane.

The president left in Air Force One for Hawaii and an event commemorating the end of World War II.

Boise National Forest re-offers timber sales, finds poor turnout

BOISE (AP) — Three companies offered nearly \$350 million more than the minimum bids Thursday to secure three sealed-back salvage sales of timber burned last year in the Boise National Forest.

But the fourth—and smallest—of the sales failed to attract any bidders for the second time.

Still, even with the premium, the three sales brought barely half the amount the Forest Service had originally expected they would raise. And environmentalists, who have questioned the value of the salvage sale program, claimed the latest auction only increased the taxpayer subsidies the timber sale campaign requires.

Sales from what was the largest salvage sale program in the nation this year were originally expected to generate about \$65 million, which Boise National Forest officials said would produce a multimillion-dollar profit over costs associated with putting the timber on the block.

But officials now estimate the sealed-back sales will gross only about \$35 million, substantially below the \$45 million cost of all the salvage sales. The Alliance for the Wild Rockies claims the subsidy is \$18 million more than that a charge the Forest Service vehemently rejects.

Environmentalists have fought to preserve wild not be logged. Most of the reduction came from areas that would have required helicopter logging.

Environmentalists say the lack of interest in recent salvage sales throughout the Northwest is evidence that the timber shortage cited by the industry is not real. The three sales that sold totaled 15 million board feet at bids totaling nearly \$2.3 billion. Boise-Cascade, Cromax Inc. and Producers Lumber Co. were the successful bidders.

Only one sale — 7 million board feet for a minimum price of \$50,000 — drew more than one bid. Cromax offered \$528,400, nearly \$23,000 more than Boise-Cascade.

The sale that failed to attract any bids totaled 3 million board feet for a minimum bid of \$290,000.

The reduction in the timber offered for sale meant some roadless areas

But the timber industry contends legal delays in salvage operations have kept trees standing so long that their value has begun to decline. It also blames the low bids on the expense of helicopter logging, which the Forest Service is requiring in many areas to prevent environmental damage from road construction.

"All the helicopter sales are leading to a shortage of choppers, so the choppers that are available are coming at a premium," said Jim Geisner, president of the Northwest Forest Association in Portland, Ore.

Craig calls Dworshak study giant leap of faith

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service praises water releases from Dworshak Reservoir for improving salmon survival, but Sen. Larry Craig leaves the weather and fish barging did the trick.

The agency on Wednesday reported a five-year study shows a dramatic increase in survival when large amounts of water from Dworshak flowed down the Clearwater and into the lower Snake River reservoirs as salmon were migrating.

Biologists found 47 to 55 percent of Snake River fall chinook salmon smolts survived this year with the help of 48 days of extra water releases from Dworshak Reservoir.

That compares to a survival rate of just 7 percent in 1992 when special releases only lasted 11 days.

But the Idaho Republican on Thursday said he thought the study was based on very little sampling over a two-month period and factors other than Dworshak should be examined.

"A giant leap of faith has been made by the FWS to claim this study is conclusive scientific justification," he said.

Craig said Idaho enjoyed lots of snow last winter that helped the migrating salmon. He also stressed

barging the smolts around the dams played an important role.

But fish advocates say barging does not help salmon since their numbers have plummeted over the years, even with the transportation.

Fish and Wildlife announced Wednesday was labeled "junk science" by the Columbia River Alliance, which represents barge operators, irrigators and other industries who have the potential to lose when dam operations are changed to accommodate the fish.

Both Craig and Sen. Dirk Kempthorne, R-Idaho, have urged Commerce Secretary Ron Brown to reconsider the National Marine Fisheries Service's reliance on increasing flows for salmon and recognize the need for a full summer pool at Dworshak for recreation.

Craig has said he is working to insert language in an energy bill to limit the use of federal agencies to control reservoir levels.

He added he was leery of Fish and Wildlife issuing a press release before announcing its study and supportive data.

"This is not just another example of the bureaucrats in Washington laboring hard to exert federal control over water in the West," he said.

Boise man tries to kill himself by drinking gasoline

BOISE (AP) — A Boise man tried to commit suicide by drinking gasoline and igniting it with a cigarette lighter while vomiting, police said.

The attempt failed, but the 32-year-old man's mobile home was gutted in the subsequent fire Wednesday night. He was hospitalized in serious condition with burns on his face, neck, head, shoulders and back, Boise Police Lt. Mike Webb said.

The fire began about 7 p.m. in the bedroom of the older, single-wide trailer, firefighters said.

A neighbor saw the fire and rushed to notify the occupant, Boise Fire Capt. Rich Randolph said.

"He noticed the owner of the trailer was sitting on his couch while the bedroom was blazing," Randolph said.

The rear half of the trailer, including the bedroom, was engulfed in flames by the time firefighters arrived.

Randolph said the fire drove the man out of the trailer, but not very far.

"When we got there, he was sitting on the porch," Randolph said.

Idaho board says Rexburg doctor molested patients

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Board of Medicine forced Rexburg doctor LaVar Withers to surrender his license last month after finding merit to charges that he sexually abused 23 patients, the Idaho Statesman reported in its Thursday edition.

"We found quite a few people that said the same things," said Dr. Jane Bennett-Munro, a Twin Falls pathologist who serves on the board, the paper said in a copyrighted story.

Withers disputed the claim. He told The Statesman on Tuesday that he let his license lapse last month because he always planned to retire once his youngest daughter left home. He says the charges are untrue.

Darlene Thorsted, board executive director, said that's wrong. Withers did not let his license lapse, he agreed to permanently surrender it, Thorsted said.

A rape response center that counseled the women said an investigation is under way, but no prosecutor would comment.

Jan Day Hartwell, executive director of the Rape Response and Crime Victim Center, Idaho Falls, said the complaints against Withers, 58, covered a period from 32 years ago to five months ago.

Hartwell said the number of women who say Withers abused them has grown from 23 last year to 59 and there were six more on Wednesday.

One woman, Beverly Rietz, 58, Rexburg, said Withers groped her while he treated her for a respiratory ailment in December, 1993. Rietz wants to see Withers prosecuted. "Stopping him from practicing medicine does not stop him from practicing sexual molestation," she said.

Cassia County ready to bring on new canine officer

BURLEY — The Cassia County Sheriff's Department without a canine sleuth since last December — is buying a new drug dog.

The department retired its \$7,500 Belgian Malinois drug dog, Shadow, purchased with community donations, much of which came from local service groups, Sheriff Billy Crystal said.

Shadow's trainer, former Detective Kelly Hutchinson, said Shadow wasn't used as much after Hutchinson became the Drug Abuse Resistance Education program officer in Cassia County schools.

Busy with D.A.R.E. duties for three years, Hutchinson said the increased inactivity didn't suit Shadow, and so Hutchinson recently donated the dog to Utah's police academy in Salt Lake City. The academy is using Shadow for narcotics training and is considering using him as a patrol dog,

Hutchinson said. Shadow helped reduce the need for personnel on crime scenes and sniffed out several drug busts, Hutchinson said. Though exactly how much Shadow accomplished, Hutchinson couldn't say, because he said he didn't keep a record of how many busts Shadow made.

Shadow worked for the Cassia County Sheriff's Department just shy of five years, Hutchinson said. He had trained Shadow since the dog was 18 months old, and handing him over to another trainer in the sheriff's department probably couldn't work if Hutchinson were to arrive on the same crime scene, he said.

The average tenure for a drug dog is seven to 10 years, Crystal said. And the department decided to retire Shadow, rather than retrain him, he said.

Hearings worry Justice official

WASHINGTON (AP) — Despite their narrowed focus, upcoming Senate hearings on the deadly FBI siege at Ruby Ridge could undermine a federal criminal probe of an alleged FBI cover-up, a top Justice Department official said Thursday.

Weaver said recently that he planned to testify. Specter did not make clear how far and with what witnesses the hearings might delve into an FBI sniper's killings of Weaver's wife, Vicki.

Gorelick, asked about potential problems with the hearings, said, "The worst-case scenario, I suppose, is the North scenario." She referred to the case of White House aide Oliver North, charged during the Iran-Contra scandal. "And that's what we're mutually trying to avoid."

The prosecution of North had to be dropped when his former boss, Robert McFarlane, said his trial testimony against North might have been influenced by hearing North's immunized testimony to Congress.

In a blunt letter to Specter on Aug. 11, Gorelick said the subcommittee's decision to prepare for and conduct the hearings during the criminal investigation "poses serious risks to effective law enforcement and could

seriously jeopardize any subsequent criminal prosecutions.

Specter said that the hearings would not interfere with the Justice Department's investigation and that "we're not about to grant anybody any immunity under any circumstances at this stage."

On Aug. 21, 1992, gunfire broke out as U.S. marshals sought Weaver's cabin, killing Samuel Weaver, 14, and deputy U.S. Marshal William Degan.

The FBI sniper who killed Vicki Weaver the next day said he was aiming at Weaver's friend Kevin Harris, who was armed and retreating to the cabin, and did not see Mrs. Weaver standing behind the cabin door.

The snipers were told they "could and should" use deadly force on any armed adult male in the open.

Spokesman Carl Stern said that in response to the subcommittee's Aug. 17 subpoena, the department has turned over 56 videotapes and audio tapes as well as several cartons of documents.

Weaver, 35, was shot in the chest in a July 31, 1992, shooting. The Justice Department is conducting a criminal investigation into whether five top FBI officials, including recently demoted Deputy FBI Director Larry Potts, covered up their approval of controversial "shoot-on-sight" orders given to FBI snipers at Ruby Ridge.

Next month, in response to congressional expressions by the Justice Department, Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., chairman of the Senate Judiciary terrorism subcommittee, offered to tailor the hearings to avoid jeopardizing the criminal investigation. The three-week hearings are scheduled to begin next Wednesday.

State hopes to continue probe into radiation

POCATELLO (AP) — State Health and Welfare officials are asking the congressional delegation to support continued studies to determine if residents received radiation doses from the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is conducting the reviews with U.S. Department of Energy money. That agency faces possible cuts in Congress.

"It is extremely important that we have an objective evaluation of the facility's past performance

and that questions people have concerning past chemical and radiation releases be answered in a scientifically defensible and credible fashion," Idaho Bureau of Environmental Health and Safety Chief Steve West said.

On behalf of Gov. Phil Batt, Health and Welfare Director Linda Caballero asked Idaho's lawmakers to back the multi-million-dollar reviews under way at the INEL.

The delegation, in turn, asked Health and Welfare for a list of reasons why the studies are important to convey to Congress.

Code talkers, Bataan vets recall war's end

ALBUQUERQUE (AP) — Navajo Code Talker Thomas Begay greeted Bataan Death March "Veterans at the Albuquerque airport Thursday as New Mexico veterans headed for opposite ends of the state to celebrate the end of World War II.

Begay was bound for Washington, D.C., and Saturday's V-J Day celebration Saturday at Fort Myer, Va., presided over by Vice President Al Gore.

At the same time, a group of four Code Talkers and 11 Bataan veterans took a flight to Hawaii to be among the thousands of veterans joining President Clinton to commemorate the end of the war. V-J Day marks Japan's conditional surrender to the Allies on Sept. 2, 1945, 44 months after the deadly Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor.

Begay was on a ship on his way to a possible junction of Japan when word came that the Japanese had surrendered after U.S. B-29s dropped atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in August. "Boy, I was excited. I say, 'Hey, I'm saved, and I'm here if

one piece," Begay said Thursday as he and his wife, Nina, and son, Army Lt. Col. Ron Begay, prepared to board their flight.

When World War II ended, Thomas Begay was a 19-year-old radio operator and member of the now-famed Code Talkers, a group of Navajo Marines.

The Code Talkers confounded the Japanese by relaying U.S. military information across the Pacific in a code based on their native tongue, coordinating everything from supply shipments to artillery bombardments.

"I might die dropped the big bomb," said Begay, who dressed for his trip in a bright yellow shirt emblazoned with a Code Talkers patch.

"Otherwise, when we landed on southern Japan ... they were ready for us."

And, he said, the invasion force would have faced "big guns, not small guns; they could blow up half of a ship."

The Bataan veterans were members of the New Mexico National Guard's 200th Coast Artillery that was ferociously the infamous Death March.

County ready to slice into salary increases

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Bonneville County workers have been advised the County Commission plans to cut \$250,000 from the next budget, mainly money earmarked for pay increases for county workers.

"Believe me, I get no personal pleasure of making decisions like this, but they've got to be done," said Commissioner Roger Christensen.

County commissioners plan a budget of \$24.9 million for the budget year starting Oct. 1, down from the current budget of \$25.2 million. A budget hearing is scheduled Tuesday.

Earlier in the month, county workers asked the commissioners for 3 percent pay increases and continuation of a longevity program that gives workers who have been with the county at least five years one-time payment of \$25 to \$1,075.

That cost the county \$140,000 this year. County Clerk Ron Longmore said. The commissioners voted at a special meeting on Wednesday to eliminate that payment starting with the next budget and to skip any cost of living increase for county workers.

"Basically, what the commission has chosen is that we would bite the bullet now," Commissioner Cliff Long told almost 100 employees. The officials said the county is

spending more than it is taking in for its justice fund programs, the sheriff's office, jail and the prosecutor. This year the difference was about \$1 million, covered in part from a reserve fund, but the officials said that can't continue.

Employees didn't deny the problem, but expressed concern they are being asked to shoulder the cutbacks.

"We're very, very thankful that we have jobs," said sheriff's office employee Karl Caspersen, after the meeting. "All that we're asking is to be able to get by on what we're getting."

The commissioners said the county will cover approximately \$250,000 in health insurance premium increases next year, which is the same as giving workers a 2.3 percent salary increase.

"They don't see it in their pockets, but if we don't pick it up, they'll see it come out of their pockets," Christensen said.

Lawmaker takes aim at grizzlies

LEWISTON (AP) — U.S. Rep. Helen Chenoweth labels a compromise proposal to reintroduce a grizzly bear in the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness as "nonsense," although the committee which proposed it includes the timber industry.

The proposal was made by the Intermountain Forest Industry Association, National Wildlife Federation, Defenders of Wildlife and the Lewiston-based Resource Coalition on Timber Supply, or ROOTS.

"It is nonsense to introduce a species that is feared and fetterome to humans and dangerous to humans into multiple-use impacted areas," the Idaho Republican said in Lewiston.

The ROOTS proposal calls for the eventual establishment of a grizzly population of 200 to 300 in a recovery zone including the Selway-Bitterroot and the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness.

The bears would be monitored to help prevent problems with humans.

"But I think it's a new day. I don't want to see the grizzlies destroyed. I think the people should go to where the grizzlies existed naturally," Chenoweth said.

Experts have rejected Chenoweth's contention that grizzlies never inhabited Idaho.

She warned the bears would affect recreation, commercial activities and big-game herds.

Daniel Johnson of Nezperce, a ROOTS spokesman, said the compromise would address most of Chenoweth's concerns. He said a member-citizens committee. He thought the congressman's issues were valid.

"I would see Helen's concerns as another opportunity to sit down and address those concerns," he said. "They need to be heard and addressed. I don't deny the representatives a lot of people who don't want the bear."

Classic-rock stalwarts play fair on Labor Day

FILER — Let's say you're a fortysomething rocker whose music is a staple of classic radio, but you aren't ready to dabble in real estate or to work on your backswing just yet.

What's a legend to do? Make a lot of trips to Idaho, for one thing.

"This will be our third this summer," said Greg Robert, keyboardist for Kansas, which will play the Twin Falls County Fair here Monday night. "Pocoello in June and Boise (for the Western Idaho State Fair) in August. We really liked Boise, though."

"We've basically played anywhere people would have us," said Phil Ehart, Kansas's drummer and co-founder. "A lot of sheds, a lot of arenas. We don't care. We're trying to build a following."

Kansas already has a formidable constituency — it's sold 25 million records in 21 years — but most of those folks now have mortgages and can hum the bass track to "Carry On, Wayward Son" in their sleep.

The band was looking to broaden its appeal, so it embarked on a 70-stop American tour this summer, to be followed by a European tour.

"We just kept adding more dates," Robert said in a telephone interview from Atlanta home. "It may be January before we get to Europe."

The tour coincides with the release of "Freaks of Nature," Kansas's first album in 10 years.

"It's very much the classic Kansas sound," Robert said. "Violin, a lot of orchestration. We wanted a sound that was identifiable to Kansas fans, and yet had an appeal to younger people."

"Now," he continues, "we have really three kinds of fans: The classic fans, the fans we picked up when Steve Morse was in the band, and the new fans who attracted to good rock 'n' roll."

"We're a band that's best known for an acoustic ballad, but first and foremost we're a rock band," said Ehart, who formed Kansas with high school classmate Kerry Livgren in Topeka

in 1970. "We wanted the music to be aggressive."

Their music is an odd amalgam of progressive-rock intricacy and warped Midwest bar-boogie that defies easy classification. A creation of rock entrepreneur Don Kirshner, the band's fortunes peaked with "Dust in the Wind" during the winter of 1977-78, but the group's albums — 13 of them — continued to sell well into the '80s.

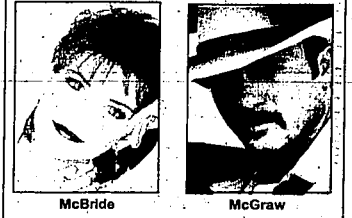
"The sound evolved over the years, but the personnel stayed remarkably consistent," said Robert, a former session keyboardist from Louisiana who joined the group nine years ago. "In the 21 years Kansas has been together, there have been just two bass players."

Ehart, guitarist Rich Williams and vocalist Steve Walsh, whose piercing tenor is the band's trademark, have been with the band since the beginning. Robert, bassist Billy Greer and violinist David Ragsdale all joined within the past decade. Although Kansas continued to tour during that period and released a best-of album in 1987, it played mostly old songs until it found a new label, Georgia-based Intersound, which specializes in reiving careers — Edgar Winter, Chuck Mangione, Jefferson Starship.

"We're 70 concerts into this (tour), and it hasn't got old yet," Robert said. "I'm still enjoying it."

The Filer concert is scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday in the fairgrounds arena. Tickets are \$10, and they're available at the fair office or by calling 326-4396.

Parade, celebration add to Blaine centennial

KETCHUM — It's already the second-longest non-mechanized parade in the West, and getting longer.

"I'd better start them on time," said Wendy Jaquet, a state legislator and director of the Sun Valley-Ketchum Chamber of Commerce who doubles as the starter for the Big Hitch Parade, the centerpiece of Wagon Days. "We have 83 entries so far."

That's almost enough to fill the triangle-shaped parade route that runs from the Horsemen's Center on Sun Valley-Road to the intersection of Main and Sun Valley Road, thence up Main and Idaho Highway 75 to Saddle Road, and back to the starting point. About 10,000 people will watch.

"That's my standard estimate," Jaquet said. "It may well be more. I can tell you this is the most parade entries we've ever had in a one-election year."

Wagon Days is easily south-central Idaho's fastest-growing community festival, a Labor Day weekend full of Western arcana ranging from "shootouts" on Main Street to pigouts at the Rotary's annual Beer Garden.

Music was never in short supply, but this year it's become institutionalized. The Wagon Days Arts and Music Festival starts Saturday-afternoon in the Forest Service Block at the corner of Washington and First streets.

2 real 'Gentlemen' head to Ketchum next week

"For, in revenge of my contempt of love
Love hath chased sleep from my enraptured eyes,
And made them watchers of mine own heart's sorrow."
— William Shakespeare, "Two Gentlemen of Verona"

KETCHUM — It's not exactly Shakespeare's finest hour. So much the better.

"This is an early play by a writer of genius, and what makes it interesting is that fact that it's not perfect," said Mark Hofflund, managing director of the Idaho Shakespeare Festival, which will bring "Two Gentlemen of Verona" to town next week. "What's already evident is his range of language and character; he honed them in later plays."

"Gents," scheduled for Thursday, Friday and Saturday in a tent on the grounds of the Tyrolean Lodge, is the ISF's second annual late-summer foray into the Wood River Valley, underwritten by hotelier Henry Taylor, who owns the Tyrolean and the Heidelberg Inn in Ketchum and the Airport Inn in Hailey.

"It's a great place to do a play," Hofflund said, "not merely because of the setting, but because of the audience. Ketchum audiences are sophisticated, and it gives us exposure to an audience we wouldn't otherwise see."

"Gents," which is being performed along with "King Henry IV" Parts 1 and 2 and "Love's Labor's Lost" as part of the Boise-based summer season series, is coming to Ketchum because it's "portable (only a 13-member cast) and accessible," Hofflund said. "It's pretty hard to take the Henrys on the road with their 50-member cast and the sets and battles," he said. "And we think 'Gents' will appeal to the audience."

The ISF is essaying Shakespeare's early plays this summer, works the playwright wrote before he became a member of Elizabethan England's literary establishment. He was 31 when he finished "Gents," in 1595, 400 years ago this summer — based on Spanish romance about loyalty and faithless love.

"Shakespeare was a student of the Renaissance, so he knew Italian literature," Hofflund said. "And he knew a great story when he heard it."

"It's not, indeed, one of his most powerful effusions," 18th century essayist Samuel Johnson wrote of the play. "It has neither many diversities of character, nor striking delineations of life; but it abounds in passion beyond most of his plays."

It's the story of two young Veronese noblemen, Valentine and Proteus, who part company when Valentine goes off to Milan to seek his fortune and Proteus stays at home with his beloved Julia. But Proteus's father, Antonio, soon ships Proteus off to Milan to make his way in the world.

In Milan, Valentine has fallen in love with Silvia, daughter of the Duke of Milan, who is pledged to Thurio. But as soon as he sets sight on her, Proteus is smitten by Silvia too, forgetting all about Julia. Julia, meanwhile, consumed with longing, dresses up as a boy and sneaks off to Milan.

Sensing a way to get rid of his rival, Proteus tells the Duke about Valentine and Silvia, and the Duke banishes Valentine, who becomes the leader of a band of outlaws.

Julia, meanwhile, overhears Proteus wooing Silvia, who is pining for Valentine and planning to sneak off to join him. Proteus foils the plan, but Valentine gets word of his treachery and confronts him. Proteus, contrite, begs Valentine's pardon and Julia is revealed.

The Duke appears and, admiring Valentine's spirit, blesses his union with Silvia and even grants amnesty to the outlaws.

"Among other things, it's a play with very strong women," said Anne Justine D'Zmura, the New York-based director of this play. "Julia and Silvia are the really conscience of the play."

Dana Slamp, a Washington actress who's a graduate student at the American Conservatory Theater, plays Julia, and Canadian actress Tina Jones, another ACT alum, is Silvia. Joe Golden, an IST veteran from St. Louis, is Valentine, and Mike-Rynn, a graduate student in the University of California at San Diego, plays Proteus.

Matt Ramsey of Buhl, a May graduate of Albertson College, has a couple of minor roles; as one of the outlaws and as one of Julia and Silvia's suitors.

'Hideaway,' 'Hunted' high on new video list

"Hideaway" (R) — This is an unpleasantly dull horror film with no real chills to speak of, aside from whatever sensations are aroused by the repeated sight of knives and razors cutting through flesh. Instead, it's a psycho killer whose sadism turns out to be eclipsed by his tediousness and you get the idea.

It's one thing to be grossed out at a horror movie; you kind of expect that. But please, not here.

The action centers around the Harrison family, already troubled by miscommunications between dad Hatch (Jeff Goldblum) and teen daughter Regina (Alicia Silverstone). Regina's typical adolescent alienation has been exacerbated by dad's compulsive protectiveness, brought on by the death of a younger daughter a year earlier.

During a ride home from an unhappy family reunion, they are caught in a traffic accident. Regina and mom Lindsey (Christine Lahti) escape with their lives, but Hatch is declared dead when he finally makes it to a hospital.

Death, as Hatch experiences it, is quite a ride. Director Brett Leonard pushes his camera toward Hatch's lifeless eyes and it seems to creep into the iris and rush through elastic, bending tunnels of neural canals, until it

plugs out into what looks like a huge spectral toilet bowl constructed out of planes and waves of translucent light.

It's a familiar sight, since the movie opens with a gruesome prologue in which a teen-ager, after bidding the murdered cadaver of his mother adieu, goes up to his room, chants some prayers to Satan and then belly flops onto an upturned dagger. This little terror, whom we later find out is named Vassago (Jeremy Sisto), undergoes the horror-ride variation on Hatch's more exultant trip, though he ends up, evacuated into more or less the same arena.

Whatever happened to Vassago is left for later, but Hatch's trip is interrupted by the intervention of super-surgeon Dr. Jonas Nyberg. Just as Hatch is about to cruise into cyberheaven hand-in-hand with his recently departed daughter, the doctor's ministrations pull him back to life.

But reunited with his family, Hatch begins to have troubling, violent visions of murder. Not only are the victims all teen-age girls about the same age and description as his Regina, but he sees the killings — which are mostly throat-slittings preceded by a moshing — from the point of view of the killer.

It takes Hatch the requisite amount of time to figure out what is going on,

and when he does, he is largely unable to do anything about it. But even the youngest horror film aficionado will immediately tumble to the fact that the poor sap made some lethal connection with Vassago during his visit to the void.

Director Brett Leonard and screenwriters Andrew Kevin Walker and Neil Zemonz obviously have a broad, general knowledge of horror film clichés, so much so that their film nearly works. (*Orange County Register*); (*Hastings*); (*Blockbuster, Video West, Old Towne Video*)

"The Hunted" (R) — Once upon a time, Christopher Lambert played Tarzan. Maybe that explains why he lumbers apoklike through "The Hunted," a so-bad-it's-a-stitch martial arts movie that should be called "Middle-Aged Mutant Ninja Turkey."

As Paul Racine, an American high-tech exec who finds himself caught between the swords of rival Japanese ninjas, Lambert looks totally lost. This guy couldn't tell a computer chip from a potato chip.

He plops down on a Nagoya beach and spies mega-babe Kirina (Joan Chen) in a backless, sideless scarlet dress, throwing back sake. He asks her what she does for a living, for crying sake. Even the Olsen Twins could see she's a cut girl.

Obviously, Racine invites Kirina to dinner and Bunraku — Japanese puppet theater. Then he lets her see

his boxers with the flying pigs on them. And then ... oh, use your imagination. That's more than the filmmakers did.

Written and directed by V.F. Lawton, who scripted "Pretty Woman" (clearly a man obsessed by hookers), this project thus observes all of the exploitation-movie commandments.

Namely, thou shalt show a sex act in the first 10 minutes; Thou shalt encourage female frontal nudity whenever possible. Thou shalt kill, early and often. And thou shalt have a hero a few beats slower than Dumbo.

Racine (obviously named for the ill-fated Wisconsin town, not the French playwright) must be the only guy in town who can't tell that the melancholy look in Kirina's eyes means that he's her last thing. That's because Meganinja Kinjo (Joim Lone) has been hired to kill her.

"You can die quick and painlessly or slowly and painfully. You choose," Kinjo declaims. In a humanitarian gesture, he then swiftly despatches her.

Kit Lawton makes certain the audience dies painfully and slowly. Kinjo's sworn enemy, the ninja Takeda, uses the beheading to have a final showdown with Kinjo, thus rendering Racine superfluous. Rarely has such a humorless style had such an unintentionally humorous effect. (*Knight-Ridder News Service*); (*Video West, Blockbuster, Hastings*)

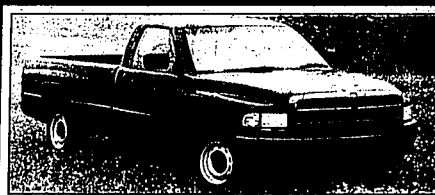

Nobel winner Grass widens his 'field'

BONN, Germany (AP) — In 1990, as Germans rallied toward unification, novelist Günter Grass was one of the lonely voices arguing against it. The nation that committed Auschwitz, Grass said, could not trust itself to be united and powerful again.

The world didn't come to an end with German unification, but Grass, the grumpy genius of such German novels as "The Tin Drum" and "Cat and Mouse," largely retreated from public life.

Recently returned with one of his most ambitious works, a 781-page exploration of German history and literature told through the characters of Fonty, a quixotic East German conversationalist, and Hirt, his secret police shadow.

Although "Ein weites Feld" is a complex mixture of themes, it gives a very pointed, often amusing portrait of German unification. It's the closest thing to the Great All-German Unification Novel that Grass has ever written. The critical flak that started flying even before the Aug. 28 release of

"Ein weites Feld" reflects the fact that Grass is a national institution, to be pilloried and praised.

Grass' work has been compared to that of magical realists like Gabriel Garcia Marquez. He weaves fantastic, allegorical characters into fables with broad historical dimensions.

Grass is a perpetual Nobel Prize candidate, he has never equalled the three-volume that began with "The Tin Drum" (1959), a war-time story of a boy who shatters himself with his screams.

In "Ein weites Feld," the main character would appear to be a reinvention of the 19th-century novelist Theodore Fontane. Grass grows his critique of reunification on the medium of the new German state Fontane observed in the late 1800s.

"Ein weites Feld" is a phrase borrowed from Fontane's novel "Effi Briest." Literally "a broad field," it implies "a complicated subject."

When Fonty says it, he's referring to the difficult accommodations to power that nonheroic people made in a totalitarian state like East Germany.

Fontane was involved in Germany's failed 1848 democratic revolution, then went over to the conservatives and was a Prussian spy.

The character Fonty, a literary communist and the "Wessiss," or West German. But never with his whole heart.

The theme of tainted virtues is taken up by Fonty and his "Day-and-Night-Shadow" as they stroll, post-Berlin Wall, through the streets of Prenzlauer Berg, East Berlin's safe society neighborhood, where "everyone" was someone else's informant, and poems were handled like secret messages.

They stop in at a McDonalds and drink a lot of milkshakes. Fonty, in his capacity as Fontane's resurrection, gets up to recite a poem about the Scottish McDonald clan. The astonished-young customers respond

with the German equivalent of "Oh, Wow!"

Like Grass, Fonty is suspicious of the modern world; his impression is that things don't really change. He watches the leaders rise and fall in the doorless elevator of the building where he has worked as a clerk under three different regimes.

Not much happens in this novel of many motifs and little plot set between 1989 and 1991. Mostly, Fonty and his family simply watch, and adapt to the way it is done.

The marriage of unification didn't work out the way it was promised by "the second-rate Bismarck," as Fonty refers to Chancellor Helmut Kohl. On unification night, as the fireworks go off, Fonty shakes his fist at the crowd:

"Yeah, celebrate, you Wessiss. We're going to wrap ourselves around you like spider monkeys. Once we get tangled around you, you'll never get loose. You wanted unity at any price. Well, it'll cost you billions."

'Lost in Place:' Growing up in suburbia

In "Iron & Silk," Mark Salzman discovered China.

In "Lost in Place: Growing Up Absurd in Suburbia" (Random House, \$22, 269 pp.), the author discovers himself. The novel is just as exotic, contradictory and confounding. This coming-of-age memoir could have been subtitled "Iron & Kkai."

The books have their similarities. The writing is consistently sweet and simple. The anecdotes are small but charming. And the writer's voice is earnest and self-deprecating. In fact, you stay with "Lost in Place" during some inconsequential moments because Salzman is simply a very likable character.

But middle-class Ridgefield, Conn., is no Shanghai.

Salzman's observations of being a Yankee in China were fresh, intriguing and revealing. Reading this brief memoir — detailing the years from his early boyhood in Ridgefield to his time at Yale University — is more like pulling an all-nighter with a new, friendly roommate keen on telling you every detail of his life story, such as it is.

So "Lost in Place" is not so much an examination

rides. He imagines himself an astronaut, and he trains for cramped spaces by sitting inside a cardboard box for hours. He pictures himself a Zen master and buys a bald-head wig to add to the look. Only when he sees a friend — a neighborhood bully turned buddy — nearly strangled by their sadistic kung fu teacher does Salzman discover the emptiness of his single-minded pursuit.

Oddly, this growing-up memoir is sparsely populated, making Salzman not the loser he feared he would be; but rather a lioner. His siblings, save one, come and go.

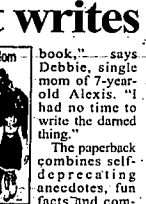
Grinding Salzman in the real world are his refreshingly nondysfunctional parents, a pessimistic Ozzie and a harried Harriet.

The sections with his adored, gloomy father make the best reading.

His staid father offers downtown but down-to-earth advice without diminishing any of his son's complex dreams. While other dads might say their sons are fools, he says his son's personal explorations have "panache." His wisdom to his son is both profound and eminently practical.

When Salzman asks him how a cosmic cloud can drift forever, his father replies: "Nobody knows, really. But you'll have a better idea once you get a job." And his first-on-ear answer to his son's climactic philosophical angst attack is tender, loving and true.

The reader might not find perfect happiness in all of "Lost in Place," but like Salzman's search for his place in the universe, the journey's not so bad.

Gone is the Titian hair, or at least any references to it. Now she's a reddish-blond. But the blue eyes still sparkle, the blue Mustang is still nifty transportation, and George and Bess are still along for the ride, all the way to Wilder University.

After 65 years and more than 125 books, Nancy Drew finally is going to college.

The aptly titled "New Lives, New Loves," the first in the Nancy Drew On-Campus series, will debut officially on Friday, but copies began sneaking into bookstores last week. Here, Nancy is 18, away from home for the first time and encountering issues such as date rape and alcohol abuse. She also has to decide how to handle her long-distance relationship with Ned Nickerson, whose chief charm seems to be that he doesn't mind Nancy being the smart one.

Meanwhile, the always capable Nancy also manages to stay in River Heights, where she has solved most of her mysteries to date. Here, she is still in high school, still hanging out with Bess and George, and still dating Ned.

What gives?

While the original series, targeted for 8- and 9-year-old readers, continues, Archway Paperbacks has started the monthly "On Campus" series in hopes of keeping readers as they enter their teens. Nancy Drew may have sold

80 million books in many languages over her lifetime, but there are always new readers to bring in the fold.

To get those readers, the editors decided Nancy's life had to be more modern, with all the attendant problems. But don't think level-headed Nancy will be tempted by sex, alcohol or drugs.

"She's going to hang on to her principles and good sense," says Arline Greenberg, executive editor at Archway.

Change has always been a constant in the life of Carson-Drew's preteen daughter. She began life in 1930, a 16-year-old debutante with golden hair. Prematurely competent, she could do anything, including changing her own tire in the first book, "The Secret of the Old Clock."

The original 56 books, written by various writers all using the pseudonym "Carolyn Keene," were condensed and re-written in 1959, in part because the series reflected racial stereotypes of the '30s. Grosset & Dunlap still publishes the originals, but Simon & Schuster acquired the rights to the character in 1979 and continued the series.

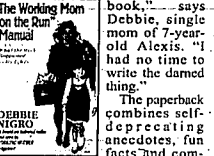

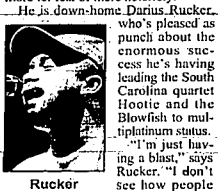

Hootie's Rucker deals with success

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — He's no Kurt Cobain, whose dependence over the pressures of fame contributed to his suicide. He's no media-shy Eddie Vedder, who won't make videos anymore for fear of more notoriety.

He is, down-home Darius Rucker, who's pleased as punch about the enormous success he's having leading the South Carolina quartet Hootie and the Blowfish to multi-platinum status.

"I'm just having a blast," says Rucker. "I don't see how people can not have fun when the one thing you wanted your whole life you finally achieved. How can you not be happy?"

The band's sunny outlook partly comes from a strong Southern upbringing.

"We all love our families," said the 29-year-old Rucker in an interview from Austin, Texas, where the band had stopped for a concert during their summer tour.

"We have no stories to go on Oprah Winfrey and tell. ... We grew up happy and we're still happy, so I guess we write the songs we do write."

Hootie's debut LP for Atlantic Records, "Cracked Rear View," has been entrenched atop Billboard's album charts for a good portion of the year with sales of over 6 million. Their top 10 singles, "Hold My Hand" and "Let Her Cry," ruled radio formats from alternative to country; the follow-up, "Only Wanna Be With You," looks to be doing the same.

Rucker's explanation for all this, aside from exhaustive touring that included some 300 dates last year?

"There's no symbolism in our songs," he said. "We say exactly what we think and what we feel. Maybe people just want an alternative to alternative. And we just happened to come along at the right time."

"What they have to say sometimes is controversial. Racism is tackled in 'Cracked Rear View,' a song to which they protest the Confederate flag that flies over South Carolina's Statehouse. Rucker says he's gotten death threats over it."

To those people, the First Amendment is the most important thing until you say something that they don't like," he said. "I just don't have time for other people's ignorance. I've experienced it every day of my life, and now I just don't have time."

You can't turn on MTV or VH-1 without seeing their cheerful faces; they've been profiled twice in Rolling Stone and in US and Entertainment Weekly magazines.

Rucker does worry about overexposure, though.

"I want the next record to do well — I want the next five records to do well. I definitely don't want people to get tired of Hootie and the Blowfish."

Hootie's most striking feature is Rucker's honey-rich, booming baritone that's straight out of a gospel choir. Guitarist Mark Bryan, bassist Dean Felber and drummer Jim "Son" Sonefeld provide the rock 'n' roll tinged with blue and soul.

They met while students at the University of South Carolina. Rucker and Bryan played as a duo before hooking up with Felber. Sonefeld joined in 1989.

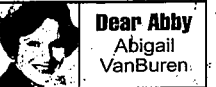

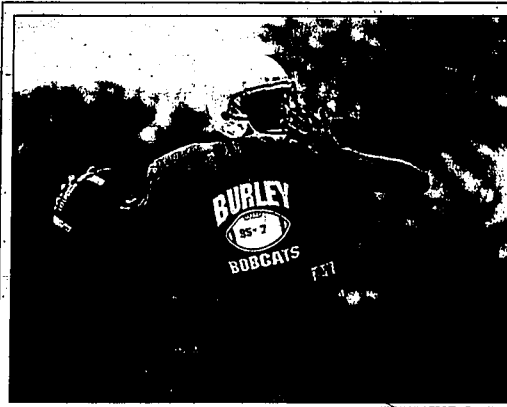

 On the unknown list are several players from Boise State University's golf team.
 The Broncos have been well represented in the tournament for the past few years — at least since BSU golf coach Bob Campbell took the controls. Campbell likes to have his charges in alien-courts competition and the Magic Valley amateur fills the bill by being played before school starts.
 To this point, while several Broncos have challenged, none has won the title. Big hitters, the course's six three pars and demand on position playing has kept them out of the winners' circle.
 "I would think the players who have been here most would have the best chance," said host Professional Mike Hamblin. "I know that Ryan Dieter is an excellent player. I don't know about all '13 Boise State players."
 The tournament follows its usual format with each flight having a 10-man elimination derby (entries based on Saturday's opening round) Saturday or Sunday.
 The field will be hosted at a barbecue Saturday night at the clubhouse.
 Flight winners will receive a special award. All flights will be paid in gross only, with the exception of the fifth-flight.

Burley QB starts season amid great expectations

BURLEY — The weight on Dru Nicley's shoulders is so heavy, his quarterback swagger is a shoulders-slumped march.
 "All the pressure of following up on Burley's 8-4 season and second place state finish in the school's first year of A-1 competition rests rigidly on Nicley's 6-3, 180-pound frame.
 "This team is going to revolve around what he does," Bobcat head football coach Bill Hicks readily admits. "If he does good, and doesn't get hurt, we'll be fine."
 Nicley and junior-running back Scott Gerratt are the only starters returning from the state runners-up, a team that graduated 23 seniors. The two are exclamation points surrounded by question marks.
 Speaking about his team and himself, Nicley sits rigidly but talks in a laid back tone. Admittedly, he hides his concerns and tries not to let the pressure show.
 The book on Nicley says he can be rattled. He had the tools to start as a sophomore, Hicks says, but his maturity kept him on the junior varsity team.
 In the state semi-finals against Post Falls last year, the then 15-year-old Nicley threw five interceptions and only one TD. But Nicley also led Burley on a game-winning drive with less than four minutes to play, completing several passes and setting up a win-

ning scamper by Gerratt.
 "I should be a lot more cool this year. Last year I was a junior. Being a senior now, I feel like I owe the team."
 Hicks has confidence that Nicley will produce, building Burley's offense around him. The senior quarterback has been freed from a mobile at the line. In fact, Hicks expect Nicley to call almost one-third of the Bobcats' plays at the line of scrimmage.
 Nicley threw 20 touchdowns and 190 yards per game while completing 54.6 percent of his passes last year, earning all-conference and all-state honors. While the Bobcats were catching opponents by surprise, Nicley's strong, accurate arm and mature ability to read defenses caught the eye of college scouts.
 The letters from Washington State University, Utah State and other major football programs wishing Nicley good luck and welcoming him to campus have been piling up all summer. Nicley, whose father played fullback at Boise State, says he has no preferences, although he concedes he would like to go to a large school.
 That's a ways away however, as Nicley faces a schedule of quarterback sacking teams with all new faces protecting him. He realizes just what is at stake of him.
 "I think we'll make up for the size in speed. I'll just have to be more aware of blitzing linebackers and such. I'll get the ball there if I have time," Nicley said, showing the confidence and leadership of a quarterback.

Income rise, but economy still sluggish

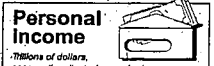
WASHINGTON — The income of Americans rose in July more rapidly than it has in six months even as consumer spending leveled off.

Plunging factory orders, due largely to auto plant shutdowns and new evidence of weak retail sales suggested the economy has not shaken off its sluggishness.

In a flurry of data on the eve of a key employment report, the government said Thursday that summer hiring at restaurants and other retail establishments helped boost personal income 0.7 percent in July — the biggest increase since an 0.8 percent gain in January. Service industry payrolls soared at a rate that was nearly double that of manufacturing.

But the Commerce Department said that spending advanced just 0.2 percent last month, the slowest pace since it was unchanged in April.

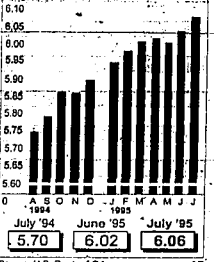
The department separately announced that severe cuts in automobile production helped push down



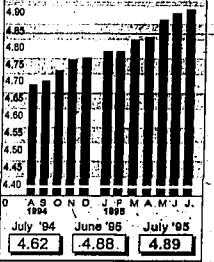
Personal Income. Seasonally adjusted annual rate. Source: U.S. Dept. of Commerce.

Meanwhile, the nation's largest retailers reported disappointing August sales, as the weather weakened demand for fall clothing and home furnishings did not fare much better.

In another report, the Labor Department said the number of Americans filing first-time claims for unemployment benefits was unchanged last week at 349,000. The less volatile four-week average rose to 342,000 from 335,000 a week earlier.

The latest statistics had minimal impact on Wall Street. The Dow Jones industrial average rose nearly 4 points by early afternoon and bond prices were little changed.

The Fed's policy-making Open Market Committee meets Sept. 26 to consider whether to adjust short-term interest rates.

The central bank trimmed the rate that banks charge each other for overnight loans by a quarter percentage point last month, reversing course after a series of moves to tighten credit.

Government faces new thrift bailout bill

WASHINGTON — Just as the massive savings and loan bailout was winding down, the government could face a new multibillion-dollar tab concerning its handling of the thrift crisis.

At issue is an obscure accounting change in the 1989 savings and loan bailout law that covered certain thrift mergers, a change critics contend cost the industry billions and led to dozens of S&L failures.

The court, ruling in a case brought by Glendale Federal

Bank and five other institutions, found that the government had broken contracts with thrifts when it changed the accounting rule and was liable for the damages. The court, however, didn't award damages in its ruling.

The case focused on Glendale, a major California thrift that claims it lost \$1.5 billion because of the accounting change. But banking experts said Thursday the case has broad implications throughout the S&L industry.

The way I look at it, this could implicate billions upon billions of dollars of claims against the government," said V. Gerald Comizio, a partner at Thacher Proffitt and Wood in Washington and former top attorney at the Office of Thrift Supervision.

"It's a mess," he added.

Turner style: Making surprise turns

Like a racing sloop furiously tacking back and forth against the wind, former championship sailor R.E. "Ted" Turner's life and business career is a history of unexpected zigs and zags.

In the 1970s, Turner was the loudmouthed "Captain Outrageous" and the "Mouth of the South." He sat in the dugout of his Atlanta Braves even to personally manage the team, and fell off a chair in a drunken stupor in front of television cameras during a news conference celebrating his America's Cup victory.

Turner's metamorphosis in the 1980s and 1990s to a media visionary couldn't have been more drastic.

The 56-year-old maverick proved that he could put news on television 24 hours a day, built a profitable TV channel from a film library everyone said he'd go bankrupt buying and married actress and liberal activist Jane Fonda when she seemed to be his ideological opposite.

Another unforeseen zig occurred Wednesday when media conglomerate Time Warner Inc. disclosed that it is negotiating to buy the Turner Broadcasting System company he heads for \$8.5 billion in stock, proving again that the most predictable thing about Turner's future is its unpredictability. No one in the media and entertainment business is more capable of surprise, changing course and proving doubters wrong.

In a business that has gotten exceedingly corporate, Ted is one of the few real showmen left. Said David Tenzer, a television agent at Creative Artists Agency in Beverly Hills, Calif. "He's very entrepreneurial in a way that harks back to studio moguls of the past."

Plenty of skeptics on Wall Street and in Hollywood remain convinced the story is far from over, and that Turner's fate will once again take sharply in a surprising new direction. They see Turner eventually backing at the deal, or another big emerging.

"Why would Ted want this?" asked one bewildered senior Hollywood executive, noting that the deal seemingly flies in the face of Turner's longtime dream of owning a television network.

The point is well taken. It's hard to imagine an entrepreneur worth \$1.6 billion—who has publicly declared in his frequently bombastic style that he wants to own the world—working as an employee at Time Warner. From his base in Atlanta, Turner has built an empire with nearly \$3 billion in annual revenue with TV programming viewed by 160 million homes in more than 200 countries.

At times, Turner has complained so bitterly about Warner, which owns 18 percent of Turner Broadcasting, he had tied his hands when it comes to buying a network that few are convinced he's given up that dream for good.

Turner recently joked to television critics that he wakes up in the middle of the night, slams his bed with his fist and screams, "I've got no network!"

In a shoot-from-the-lip comment that caught Turner some flak, he went so far as to compare his being prevented from buying a network to the plight of Jews in Germany during World War II.

The list of possible scenarios for Turner being discussed around Hollywood was seemingly endless Wednesday. One was General Electric Co. trumping Time Warner with a bid for Turner, or even making a huge bid for Time Warner itself. Another is that Turner was initially skeptical of Time Warner's overtures, but warmed to the idea because he has an eye on possibly running Time Warner himself someday. Regardless, Turner's fate remains largely in the hands of TCI and its chief executive, John Malone, who has yet to give a deal with Time Warner his blessing.

Or maybe, just maybe, Turner has changed his goals and the proposed merger is just what it seems.

People close to Turner insist that he was profoundly influenced by the recent flurry of media mergers—capped by the \$19 billion Walt Disney Co. deal for Capital Cities/ABC announced in late July. Turner, they say, realizes that he must be part of a

big conglomerate to compete. "The Disney-ABC deal was a wake-up call to all of us," said one senior Turner executive.

Said another senior Turner executive: "Ted is convinced that content will be critical to the future, and that this company will be one of the largest, if not the largest, content company in the business."

A former Turner executive said that he believed Turner realized that he cannot get the money to finance a bid for a network without investors who would undoubtedly rein him in.

"He probably looked at his smaller army, and said commanding the North-ern troops in this version of Ted's Civil War is a better place to be," the executive said.

Some, see the potential deal with Time Warner as typical of Turner's rash moves in the past.

"Ted is an extraordinarily smart, adept player so successful because he's a buccaner rather than a corporate type. He's got real vision, it's tremendously entrepreneurial, and he's willing to take enormous risks," said Peter Chernin, Chairman of Fox Films Entertainment.

Although Turner seemingly acts on

instinct at times, those close to him say that isn't the case at all. Beneath Turner's image as a seat-of-the-pants, riverboat gambler is someone who is far more calculating in making decisions than he gets credit for, CGSE associates say, and he's undoubtedly doing the same with the Time Warner proposal.

"The biggest misconception about Ted is that he shoots from the hip. The opposite is true. He gives a tremendous amount of thought to things. Before he does something, he takes all the right steps he's supposed to take and is as careful as the most conservative businessman in America," said Alan F. Horn, chairman and chief executive of the Hollywood production company Castle Rock Entertainment that Turner bought two years ago.

More important than calculation, when Turner sets a goal, he pushes to the limit to reach it. It's no coincidence that "Tenacious" was the name he gave his boat.

CNN anchor Bernard Shaw said, "People laughed in his face and ours, saying he'd go broke because there wasn't enough news to fill the country and the world 24 hours a day. But his character and his sense of history

wouldn't let him give up. After the boys and girls at the other networks stopped sneering, they started looking over their shoulders." In 1976, Turner revolutionized cable television when he began transmitting the signal of his local Atlanta UHF station, which he bought in 1970, nationwide to cable systems hungry for new programming. People in Idaho could watch Turner's Atlanta Braves, which he bought earlier in 1976, and would soon watch the Atlanta Hawks basketball team, which he also acquired.

A Civil War fanatic, Turner appeared in a cameo role as a Confederate officer in the film "Gettysburg" that his company financed.

His love of "Gone With the Wind," a film he acquired when he bought the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer library in 1986, is shown by a painting of Clark Gable as Rhett Butler outside his office. Turner named his son "Rhett," and would have named a daughter "Scarlett" if his wife at the time had objected.

In 1980, Turner made his biggest bet to date when he started the News Channel amid conventional wisdom that it would drive him into bankruptcy.

"I remember being at a baseball game with Ted," recalls New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner. "There was a group of us, and he was saying he wanted to broadcast the news all day long because he had to get until 6 and 11 to get news. 'What the hell is he talking about.' But damn if he didn't do it."

Changes in regulations make blockbuster deals more attractive

These are supposed to be the somnolent dog days of summer, but tell that to the busy Hollywood and Wall Street dealmakers hoping to put together yet another blockbuster union, this time between Time Warner and Turner Broadcasting.

"This is a wild-ass August," said Bishop Chen, a senior analyst with Paul, Reubens & Associates, a media research firm in Canada. "And there's probably some more to come."

What's behind this summer's feeding frenzy, triggered by Walt Disney Co.'s \$19 billion play for Capital Cities/ABC? Plenty.

The big fish devouring their smaller counterparts in the Darwinian fashion are taking advantage of an unusual convergence of forces—a friendly political and regulatory atmosphere in Washington, the growing global appetite for entertainment, the long bull market on Wall Street and the coming-of-age of sophisticated technologies that make it possible to distribute con-

tent worldwide in new, less expensive ways.

"The whole thing driving this is the worldwide demand for content, shelf space and distribution," said Raymond T. Bennett, a Los Angeles attorney whose clients include Turner Broadcasting. He called this summer's hypercharged deals "the biggest change in the industry since sound movies."

That might be hyperbole, but the shifts are indeed dramatic. The proposed mergers—including Disney and ABC, Westinghouse Electric Corp. and CBS, Barry Diller's purchase of Silver King Communications, a TV station owner, and now Time Warner and Turner—would pave the way for an industry of vertically integrated powerhouses with extensive control over both the content and distribution of programming.

"This is a cataclysmic summer, a watershed," said Harold Vogel, an investment analyst with Cowen & Co. in New York.

The most important factor in precipitating this dramatic consolida-

tion in the entertainment industry might be the laissez-faire attitude toward big business that prevails now in Washington. Changes in the regulations governing networks and telecommunications companies—some already implemented and others imminent—are making such deals ever more attractive.

In particular, the Federal Communications Commission has been persuaded by network lobbyists not to renew the so-called "fin/syn" rules, set to expire Nov. 1. Under those 25-year-old regulations, networks were prohibited from having a financial interest in the programs they aired or from profiting on the rerunning of those programs in syndication—which meant, in practical terms, that movie studios could not own television networks.

Without those rules in place, networks and studios are eager to join forces, a TCI Disney's proposed purchase of Cap Cities/ABC. Such integrated companies can fully control both the production and distribution of movies and TV programs.

Moreover, telecommunications reform is expected to encourage large broadcasting companies to grow even bigger. Current rules dictate that a single company's television stations may reach no more than 25 percent of the nationwide viewing audience. Proposed laws would raise that to 30 percent or 35 percent. The prospect of that change was instrumental in encouraging Westinghouse to bid for CBS. If that deal goes through, Westinghouse would own 15 stations nationwide, just under a third of potential viewers.

Congress also is expected to abolish limits on the prices cable companies may charge subscribers, making the economics of a deal such as Time Warner and Turner—with their hefty combined cable ventures—very appealing.

This rush to deregulate signals Washington's acknowledgment that it simply can't keep up with the pace of change in entertainment and telecommunications, industry observers said.

"It is a colossal shrug of the gov-

ernment's shoulders," said Peter Dekom, an entertainment lawyer in Los Angeles. It's as if, Dekom added, regulators and lawmakers are saying, "We can't handle this. There's too much change. Let's leave it alone."

Companies might also figure that today's favorable climate cannot last. If the pendulum can swing away from regulation, it could also swing back. Some players probably have the notion that "once you get under the tent, you're safe," said Everette Dennis, executive director of the Freedom Forum Media Studies Center at Columbia University.

And in the wake of the Disney/ABC agreement, there is a fear among many media companies that worthwhile assets won't stay around for long.

Industry watchers already are speculating about what the next megadeal might be, with the smart money on Rupert Murdoch's News Corp. and Viacom Inc., owner of MTV and Paramount, as prospective buyers.

"The problem is there are only so

many great properties available," said Michael Wolf, head of the media and entertainment practice at Booz Allen & Hamilton, a consulting firm. The Disney deal set off a chain reaction among paranoid companies afraid of being de-

stroyed. "You're seeing the American version of the Japanese keiretsu," Chen said. "If the competition gets bigger, you need to get bigger."

And basic corporate finance has played a big role in all the turmoil. The long run-up in the stock prices of many entertainment companies has made it relatively easy to fund big stock-swap transactions. Despite the cloud of excitement that seems to hover over the entertainment business, moreover, the fact remains that these businesses face shrinking margins and ever more frenzied competition. Teaming up to gain a wider range of revenue streams can help ease that problem, Wolf said.

"The Viacom-Paramount merger," he added, "proved that such deals could be successful."

Seymour brings real life to screen

Leave it to Hollywood to take advantage of real-life situations and change them to fit a script need.

The latest to participate in a real-life-meets-TV script is Jane Seymour, star of CBS' "Doctor Quinn, Medicine Woman", who is expecting twins in December.

The audience will see her advancing in her pregnancy on the popular Saturday show. But viewers won't see the blessed event until May, which just happens to be TV sweeps time (when networks determine ad rates based on ratings).

How can it be done? Simple: Episodes of "Dr. Quinn" will be filmed months in advance, so the audience won't be able to see Seymour in the advanced stages of pregnancy until the show's producers want them too.

The actress is married to director James Keach, who has a teenage son, and Seymour has two children of her own plus a teenage stepdaughter. The "Dr. Quinn" star says the family already knows the gender of the twins but won't reveal it until much later.

For Seymour, family life is ex-

remely important, and she is heavily involved in child abuse awareness through her role as an ambassador for Childhelp U.S.A., which she's held for about 10 years.

"Since I could walk and talk," she explains, "I've been helping raise funds for children's charities. I never knew abuse in my own family (in England), but I thought it was appalling that this goes on here."

Seymour started working for the cause with a British child abuse charity and continued after she came to the United States.

"When people find out about my dedication to help stop child abuse, they open up to me," she says. "Also, there are a lot of kids who don't know whom to trust or where to turn for help."

"Others are confused as to what is inappropriate behavior from another person," Seymour continues. "It's very important to teach your kids early on they have rights to their bodies."

She says she doesn't think physical hitting aids in disciplining a child. Instead she practices a reward system that seems to work for her.

"Every parent gets frustrated with kids testing them to the limit. I've set up a reward system

that the kids can earn, whether it's pocket money or staying up late to watch a certain TV show."

She adds: "I reward good behavior. But if you do something I specifically asked them not to do, they lose a privilege. All you have to do is follow through on your threat a couple of times and they get the message."

Seymour also insists on communication and honesty, always trying to keep the lines of communication open.

"I do my best acting as a mother," she laughs. "All mothers go through the same problems with their kids. We all have busy lives and there are always distractions. But I feel the most important thing is to find the time to communicate with your children. Let them know when you're happy or sad, and listen to them when they are happy or sad."

Spending time with her children is special to Seymour, who goes home every night after work - no matter how many hours she puts in - to see her youngsters. After being with them as long as possible, she studies her lines for the next day's filming.

Sometimes her children visit the "Dr. Quinn" set, which is in the hills of Santa Monica, Calif., near their Malibu home.

Q: Why would Marlon Brando refuse to see the movies he makes? — K.L.

Q: Is it really true that Susan Olsen, who played Cindy, the youngest Brandy, is fighting a losing battle against alcoholism? — W.R.

A: Susan implores me to please not consign her to the dust heap of child TV stars defeated by drugs, booze or both: Olsen, 33, admits to driving while under the influence of alcohol. It happened about a year or so ago on the West Coast. As a result, she had to enroll in special drivers ed courses assigned to DUI cases. That's when a supermarket tabloid got a hold of the story and blew it way out of proportion.

Olsen, who looks great all grown up, tells me she's been through one marriage and, late last year, got engaged to a salesman by the name of Mitch. Susan has been working as a graphic artist for many years.

Her yearnings to get back into showbiz have taken her behind, and not in front of, the cameras. Olsen was the co-executive producer of the TV special "Brady Bunch Home Movies."

Q: I used to get such a kick out of seeing George Segal play the banjo on various TV talk shows. Is it true that he is due to make his nightclub debut soon, and if so, will he be playing his banjo? — P.R.

A: Those reports got a bit garbled, though there is some connection to the star of such movies as "A Touch of Class" and "No Way to Treat a Lady." Truth is, it wasn't Segal, 61, but his talented daughter Polly, 27. She sang jazz and show tunes at Manhattan's Supper Club this summer. Her proud papa was, of course, in attendance.

Polly was supposedly lined up for a return engagement at the end of last month. I suppose there is always the possibility that George might strum his banjo for Polly. However, I can't see his second gig was canceled, so Polly is back waiting tables until her next show.

Q: If people in the Hamptons, the chic Long Island beach area, do everything they can to welcome the Hollywood crowd, why did a homeowner, out there sue Melanie Griffith? — T.N.

A: The businesses may be greeting the stars, but many residents resent the crowds, the traffic and such. The reason one couple, Graham and Maura

Clark, are suing Griffith is that they claim she trashed their \$3.5 million East Hampton house last summer.

The Clarks, who rented the house to Griffith for \$85,000, say that furniture legs were chewed by pets, crystal glasses were broken and silk rugs were ruined, among other things. They are asking for \$33,000 to cover the damages.

Q: Ellen Barkin is one of our favorite actresses, and we were surprised to learn of her plan to become a fashion model. What prompted her decision to leave acting? — L.C.

A: The Bronx-born Barkin turned 41 in April, an age that pretty much rules out the start of a fashion modeling career. Still, Ellen remains in terrific shape, perhaps because she's the mother of two children (Jack, 6, and Romy, 3) from her unsuccessful six-year marriage to Gabriel Byrne.

Since the split, she's become very much her own woman — dating younger men, playing sexy bad-girl parts in such films as this year's "Bad Company," learning how to drive (finally) and taking what she wears very seriously.

Barkin says she fantasizes about being a fashion model. In fact, she hangs out with such supermodels as Linda Evangelista and Naomi Campbell. They provide useful tips on how to walk and what to wear for Ellen's publicity tours. It seems that Barkin is a model student.

Q: Of the four actors who played James Bond before Pierce Brosnan, who played Bond in the most films? — J.L.

A: Prior to Brosnan, six actors have starred as Agent 007. Barry Nelson first played Bond in 1954 on TV, "Casino Royale" aired live on "Climax," an anthology series.

Sean Connery followed in seven films, from 1962 to '83. David Niven starred in 1967's spoof "Casino Royale," then George Lazenby played the debonair agent for one film, "On Her Majesty's Secret Service" in 1969.

Roger Moore inherited the role — and tied Connery with seven Bond films — from 1973 to '85. Timothy Dalton took it on for two outings, in 1987 and '89.

If Brosnan delivers the goods in the soon-to-be-released "Goldeneye," he

may well be on his way to setting a new record.

Q: I heard that Donald Trump has sold off most of the fine antique furnishings that came with his Palm Beach estate. What has he replaced all these treasures with? — T.G.

A: Apparently, Trump likes to purchase reproductions for use in Mar-a-Lago, the legendary Palm Beach estate formerly owned by Majorie Merriweather Post, which he's turned into an expensive private club.

Trump has been a familiar figure in the antique shops of nearby West Palm Beach, where he enjoys doing his own buying and negotiating. A Florida source told me that Trump's taste is on the flashy side.

"The things he buys are nowhere near the quality of the originals, and the sconces, chairs and paintings he goes for are really not top quality, even for copies," says my Palm Beach spy.

"When he comes into an antique shop, it's usually with a retinue in tow, complete with one man standing guard over his Italian car in the parking lot. Donald doesn't buy anything without getting the price down first, and a favorite bargaining phrase is, 'You'll have to do better,' uttered rather curtly in a take-it-or-leave-it manner."

Q: As ardent Jerry Lewis fans, our vacation plans included seeing Jerry on stage in New York, but we missed him. You mentioned awhile back that he

would be taking "Damn Yankees" on the road. When will that be? — G.M.

A: Lewis is now preparing for a 70-city national tour of the musical. The show opens Sept. 25 in Baltimore, and it will tour for two years. Maybe you can catch him in your hometown.

Q: Why was Elvis Presley's doctor in the news again? — I.T.

A: In July, the Tennessee Board of Medical Examiners revoked Dr. George Nichopoulos' license because he overscribed addictive drugs to his patients, including singer Jerry Lee Lewis.

Nichopoulos, 67, said the decision by the board was "idiotic" and blamed the action on lingering resentment over Presley's death in 1977, when traces of many different prescription drugs were found in his body.

Q: Isn't it sad but true that Tiasha Campbell has tested positive for HIV? — C.W.

A: Rumors began flying around Hollywood that Campbell was exposed to the AIDS virus because of her friendship with Easy-E, the rap singer who died in March from an AIDS-related illness.

Campbell, 26, who portrays Gina on Fox TV's comely series "Martin," says flatly that she does not suffer from the virus. What's more, Campbell is making appearances on TV talk shows to spread the good word. The fact that she's HIV-negative is positive news to Tisha's fans.

I'm encouraged with the steps the show has taken regarding Julia and Noah."

Keith felt it was clever of the writers to introduce the race issue in a unique way. The question of color didn't come up until Julia kept retreating from making love with Noah and he began to think it was because he was a black man. As it turned out, Noah learned that Julia had been raped and was still dealing with the aftermath. But all has been resolved and the two are now lovers, enlightening thoughtful comments from the viewers. Keith says he and Sydney Penny (Julia) have a definite rapport which translates quite well on the small screen.

Keith has been interested in acting ever since he was a kid. He graduated from New York University and studied with the Playwrights Horizons and Circle In The Square Theatre schools. Along the way, Keith developed a great respect for Shakespeare and has played many roles in the Bard's canon. He says working on a TV soap opera affords actors the opportunity to try and do their best work day after day. If one day doesn't produce the satisfactory results, there's always tomorrow.

In addition to his work on "All My Children" and the stage, Keith became involved with a program connected with the New Jersey correctional system. "Young offenders, both men and women between the ages of 14 and 18, were encouraged to write plays. Naturally, most of them wrote about their inner-city life. Professional actors would appear in and direct staged readings of the young people's work. It was a very satisfying experience and a learning process for all concerned." The actor is happy with the direction "All My Children" has taken the Noah-Julia storyline, and he thinks it may have opened some new avenues in soap opera storytelling.



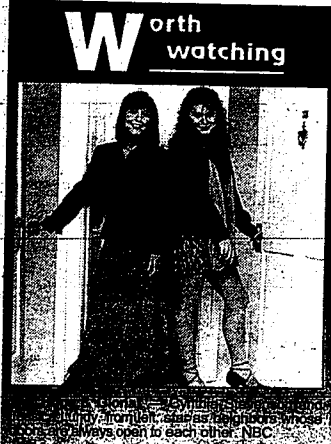

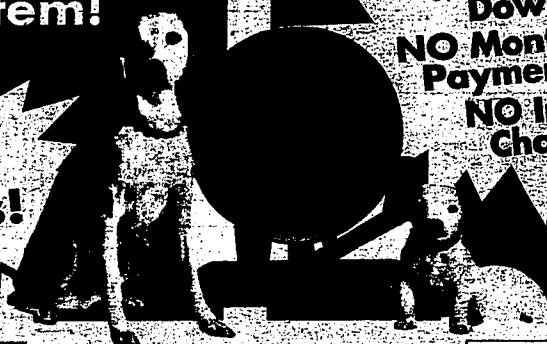
