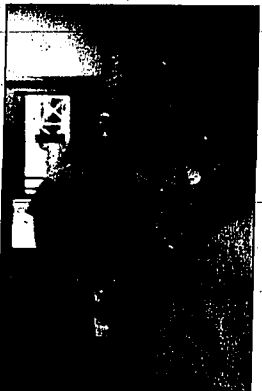

# Youth, 16, charged in shooting

## Twin Falls father of 4 listed in critical condition

TWIN FALLS — A Twin Falls teen-ager was charged Thursday with shooting 36-year-old Miguel Flores Sr. outside his Twin Falls home Wednesday night.

Authorities refused to identify the boy because of privacy laws that protect juveniles charged with crimes. The Times-News has learned the boy's name is Gudone Nanthonong, 16. His 20-year-old brother was charged as an accomplice.

Flores, a machinery operator with four children, was shot in the abdomen with a small caliber handgun during an escalating fight between his family and belligerent youths outside his home at the El Millagro housing complex, police said.

"Witnesses indicate he tried to break up the fight, then he became involved in the fight, then he got shot," said Lt. Ron Axtman of the Twin Falls Police Department.

Flores was in critical but stable condition at Magic Valley Regional Medical Center Thursday evening.

Two teen-agers with the shooter were

injured when the bleeding Flores grabbed a rifle inside his home and shot up their car before they fled, police said. Knot Khovvinn, was treated for cuts received from glass fragments, and Thanavahn Rathomone refused medical treatment for a gunshot wound in his leg, police said.

The 16-year-old boy is charged with aggravated battery. If convicted, the juvenile could face six months in detention or an indeterminate period of time in the custody of the Idaho Department of Juvenile Correction, perhaps without incarceration.

Prosecutors cannot prove the juvenile tried to murder Flores — a crime which

would have automatically waived the juvenile into adult court, said Twin Falls County Chief Deputy John Lothspeich.

"We don't have sufficient evidence to prove there was the intention to murder, just that a shot was fired," Lothspeich said. Two women with "personal differences" started fighting, then others joined in, escalating the fight into a brawl, Axtman said.

During the fight, Matthew Flores Jr., 14, heard a gunshot and saw his father clutching his side — the accused 16-year-old boy was holding a handgun threateningly several feet away, according to an affidavit written by Detective Dave Heidemann of the Twin Falls Police Department.

Then the 16-year-old and others began driving away in their car with a shattered back window and flattened tire, the affidavit said. Police later arrested the juvenile, whom witnesses identified as the shooter.

Another juvenile and Nanthonong's adult brother also appeared in court Thursday on charges of being "accessories" in the shooting. Magistrate Charles Brum-

# Tribes can claim museum pieces

TWIN FALLS — Phyllis Oppenheim doesn't know how many bones are in the Anasazi burial pot.

Oppenheim, curator for the Herrett Museum, has peered into the pot, but respect has kept her from spreading the contents out for examination.

Respect also means the pot is not displayed or photographed, and is moved only when necessary. Offering evidence of tribal burial customs and beliefs, it is nonetheless cloaked in mystery. Its late donor, Norman Herrett, kept no records on it, and Oppenheim has no idea where it came from or when.

"It was here when I got here in 1979," she said.

One of four American Indian skeletal or burial artifacts at the museum, it could eventually return its tribal owner, if such a tribe would step forward to claim it. Thursday was the deadline for museums to submit lists of human remains and burial objects to tribes and to the federal government under the 1990 Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act.

Oppenheim has sent letters to six or seven likely owners in the Southwest.

"It's a very long process," she said. "It could take years and years."

Of 15,000 total artifacts, only about 700 are American Indian objects — not a major part of the museum's collection. The Indian artifacts are also among the newest items — the oldest, 15,000-year-old arrowhead, is a mere babe compared with a 2 million year-old hammer stone from

# Gridlock over budget deepens

WASHINGTON — Defying a veto threat, the Republican-controlled Congress passed legislation Thursday night to end the three-day partial shutdown of government, but only if President Clinton agrees to balance the budget in seven years.

Clinton said the GOP proposal would lock in "crippling cuts in Medicare" and other programs and demanded — unsuccessfully — that lawmakers restore government services without preconditions. He also announced plans to recall thousands of furloughed workers to process claims for Social Security and other benefits.

With the two sides seemingly at gridlock, Democrats savaged House Speaker Newt Gingrich for claiming Clinton had snubbed him recently aboard Air Force One, and for saying he had toughened his terms on the budget battle as a result. The legislation to restore government services through Dec. 5 cleared the Senate on a near party line vote of 60-37. Seven Democrats sided with Republicans, but the roll call was still short of the two-thirds majority that would be needed to override a veto.

The House had approved the measure

several hours earlier, in a midnight-hour call that produced surprising Democratic support.

Clinton's resolve in the stalemate brought a swift rebuttal from Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole: "He doesn't want a balanced budget. ... That's the issue."

At three days, the partial shutdown was the longest ever arising from one of the nation's periodic budget wars. And barring an unexpected concession, it seemed likely to stretch into Thanksgiving week.

Republicans are hoping to pass a separate measure containing their balanced budget plan by the weekend, a proposal that squeezes hundreds of billions from Medicare, Medicaid and other social programs, and also finances a tax cut. Clinton has threatened to reject it, as well, in part over Medicare. Republicans and Democrats alike said they doubted serious compromise talks would begin until that veto had been cast.

Republican leaders said they were willing to reopen talks with Clinton on ending the impasse that has forced huge sections of the government to remain closed since Tuesday and disrupted normal Treasury borrowing. Gingrich, R-Ga., offered to meet Thursday night.

The House speaker has been in combat mode for several days now, accusing President Clinton of lying, of being unwilling to work, of deliberately snubbing him and

Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole on their trip to Israel last week.

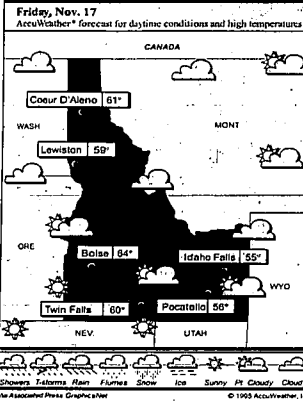
Gingrich neared rhetorical meltdown Wednesday morning with his angry account of perceived mistreatment aboard the presidential aircraft and his contention that it led in part to this week's government closings. The New York Daily News captured the situation with a front-page cartoon of Gingrich in a diaper haying a tantrum.

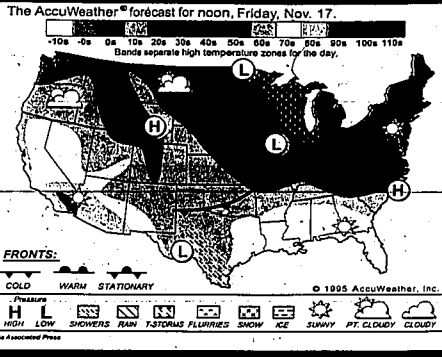
## Idaho weather summary

# Engineering transfer plans set

BOISE (AP) — Up to 115 students now enrolled in three University of Idaho engineering programs in Boise each may get an estimated \$5,000 per semester in state assistance if they decide to transfer to the Moscow school when Boise State University takes over.

The provision was adopted by the state Board of Education Thursday as part of a plan for transferring responsibility to Boise State, effective next July 1, for undergraduate civil, mechanical and electrical engineering programs in Boise.

The University of Idaho will remain in control of graduate engineering studies in Boise and Moscow.

The implementation plan was developed by University of Idaho Interim President Thomas Bell, Boise State President Charles Ruch and Board of Education Executive Director Rayburn Barton after the board last month approved creation of an independent engineering

school at Boise State.

That reversed a January decision to invest more money in a University of Idaho-run cooperative program in Boise rather than create free-standing school at Boise State in response to calls from southwestern Idaho's technology companies for more education opportunities for their employees.

Bell said Thursday he still does not support the transfer. But given last month's action, "I believe this implementation plan is the best solution and will serve the most people for the longest period of time."

It calls for the University of Idaho to keep the \$540,000 it diverted from other purposes to finance improvements in the Boise operation this year and to get another \$500,000 that lawmakers had earmarked for the Boise program.

Boise State will keep the remaining \$1.2 million the Legislature pumped into the Boise engineering program under pressure from busi-

nesses led by Micron Technology Inc., and the board will augment that by diverting up to \$250,000 more for the new program.

Another \$250,000 will be made available next year and again the year after to help any juniors and seniors in the Boise program who choose to finish their studies in the accredited program in Moscow.

This year's seniors will be able to complete a University of Idaho degree in Boise in the upcoming spring semester. But if any of those 35 seniors want to move to Moscow for their final undergraduate semester — even though control of the Boise program will not be transferred until July 1 — Barton said the University of Idaho will pick up the tab for their expenses.

The Boise programs will not be accredited once Boise State takes over. But Ruch said officials agree that the school will not be starting from scratch in the process of gaining accreditation.

stringent balanced-budget plan.

Bow baskets, knives and arrowheads could all be turned back to the tribes depending on their religious significance.

"I can understand where they're coming from," she said. "If you are a Christian and go into a museum and they're handling artifacts in a disrespectful way, this is very disconcerting."

The mailing of detailed letters to tribes is the latest step in a job that required two full months of Oppenheim's time. The next move is up to the tribes, who will decide which items belong to them and whether they want them back.

But the repatriation project could last years.

Lack of money could hinder

cash-strapped tribes from visiting museums and identifying artifacts, said Esther Plenty Hawk, acting cultural resource coordinator for the Shoshone-Bannock tribe at Fort Hall, which unsuccessfully applied for a federal grant several years ago.

Her tribe is also perplexed by the cultural implications of the project — they have no reburial ceremony and are unsure whether they can create one.

"Once you bury them in the first place, that's it," she said. "We can't just go and dig a hole and bury them. There are certain things that we've been taught."

There is also the matter of deciding just which remains are theirs and which belong to other tribes, not easy to do with skeletal frag-

ments thousands of years old. Some tribes have already rejected the disturbed remains, and other tribes could easily end up tussling over artifacts they both claim, Plenty Hawk said.

How did human remains end up in museums anyway?

Most of them turned up during archeological digs, and researchers kept them to determine their age and sex, and recently use DNA testing to determine relationships and population movements, said Robert M. Yocum II, director of the Idaho archeological survey.

This group, a section of the Idaho State Historical Society, has the remains of up to 100 individuals, he said. The remains are kept in a secured, climate-controlled storage area.

back released 20-year-old Khone Koo Nanthong, saying there was insufficient evidence to keep him jailed, though he noted his experience in dealing with the man over the years.

Khone Nanthong has a history of crimes, including aggravated battery, trespassing and car burglary, according to court records. He refused to tell police who shot Flores, according to Heidemann's affidavit.

Khone Nanthong lives at a Twin Falls home where last month a boy shot at a group of people threatening him, then two members

of the group later shot at an off-duty lieutenant, Axman said.

A third defendant was charged in juvenile court Thursday with being an accessory. Lotspeich said. A judge is determining whether to release him on his own recognizance, Lotspeich said.

**Family appeals for husband to come home**

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Family members Thursday appealed for Joe Waldholtz, the missing husband of a Utah congressman, to return home so they can find out what happened to at least \$600,000 of his grandmother's money.

His father, dentist Harvey Waldholtz, and cousin Steven Slesinger said they were accusing the former Pittsburgh Republican insider of stealing the money. Joe Waldholtz, 32, dropped out of sight Saturday.

Slesinger's voice broke as he spoke to a crowd of reporters and an array of television cameras. "If you can hear me out there, Joe, please come on back," he said. "Whatever financial difficulty exists, we'd like to iron it out."

The men said they were concerned about Joe Waldholtz's health and welfare.

The Justice Department issued an

arrest warrant Wednesday for the missing man. The department is seeking him as a material witness in a grand jury investigation of possible bank fraud schemes involving the couple's jointly held accounts.

The accounts were at the Congressional Federal Credit Union in Washington and at First Security Bank in Salt Lake City.

The FBI interviewed Harvey Waldholtz on Wednesday, the dentist said.

Harvey Waldholtz and Slesinger obtained a court order Nov. 2 ordering the younger Waldholtz to return all the money to his grandmother's

estate within 10 days. He did not comply.

The dentist's mother, Rebecca Levenson, put Joseph Waldholtz in charge of investing some of her money. Mrs. Levenson suffers from Alzheimer's disease and last May was declared incompetent to manage her own affairs. Harvey Waldholtz and Slesinger are co-guardians of her estate.

The men said they were unsure how much money was missing.

The total was at least \$600,000 and could be as much as \$1.3 million, they said.

The younger Waldholtz oversaw the successful 1994 campaign of U.S. Rep. Enid Greene Waldholtz, R-Utah. She spent \$1.8 million on her campaign, more than any other candidate. The FBI is investigating where the money came from. Harvey Waldholtz said the family never knew of any money con-

tributed to the campaign.

"At all times we believed the money was invested on behalf of Mrs. Levenson and that the proceeds of the investment were being used to manage her estate," the dentist said.

He said he last saw his son Saturday morning about 10 a.m. "He was his usual jovial self," the older Waldholtz said. "There was no indication he was under any pressure."

Attorney William L. Stang said Slesinger became suspicious when he learned that Mrs. Levenson applied for a bank loan.

"And she certainly didn't need the money," he said. Records showed Mrs. Levenson owed \$90,000 on the loan in June 1993, Stang said.

Joe Waldholtz agreed several times to explain Mrs. Levenson's finances, but never showed up, Stang said.

**McVeigh lawyer says he won't use insanity defense**

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Timothy McVeigh will not use an insanity defense when he goes on trial in the Oklahoma bombing, his lawyers said Thursday.

"The psychiatric and psychological evaluations aren't 100 percent completed, but from what we know at this point we have no reason to assert a mental defect," attorney Stephen Jones said. "He's as sane as any lawyer or reporter."

He said McVeigh has been pronounced competent by Dr. Seymour Haltek, a University of North Carolina psychiatrist who testified for the defense in Susan Smith's trial for drowning her two sons in South Carolina. Other experts also were examining McVeigh.

Jones has said McVeigh's defense will directly challenge the evidence against him in the April 19 bombing in the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building. McVeigh and Terry Nichols face the death penalty if convicted in the blast, which killed 169 people and injured more than 500.

McVeigh and Nichols go on trial May 17 in Lawton, about 90 miles southwest of Oklahoma City.

# Study: Shock focus of TV talk shows

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sally makes them cry. Jerry "ousts" them. And Geraldo brings out the criminal files.

In one way or another, America's television talk show hosts score an average of 16 "ambush disclosures" an hour on guests, according to a study released Thursday.

"Often guests have either little or no control about the disclosure," said Sandi Smith, one of the Michigan State University researchers who conducted the analysis. "These are ambush disclosures," she said.

The Kaiser Family Foundation commissioned the study, released at a news conference in Washington, saying it was an independent attempt to analyze the content of top-rated TV talk shows in light of criticism over their content.

The analysis of 200 videotapes and transcripts of daytime talk shows over the summer presents what any casual viewer already knows: Hosts

and guests talk mostly about family, personal relationships and sex.

"The level of personal disclosures is a trend," said Matt James, a spokesman for the Kaiser group. "In early talk shows something racy might have been Phil Donahue taking belly dancing lessons. ... Now it's all disclosures, particularly about sexual activities."

James said talk show hosts were invited to a panel discussion built around the release of the study, but they all declined.

The study said the most common disclosures per hour were:

- Five of a sexual nature, including one about sexual orientation.
- Four about a personal attribute such as adultery or health.
- Three about abuse.
- Two about an embarrassing situation.
- Two about criminal activity.

The study said 42 percent of guests made the disclosures about

themselves, 30 percent were made by other guests and 28 percent by hosts.

In comparing hosts, the study authors noted that Geraldo Rivera had the most criminal disclosures, at seven per hour; Jenny Jones revealed more sex secrets, at six per hour; Jerry Springer disclosed more about sexual orientation, with three incidents per show; and Sally Jessy Raphael made more guests cry, disclosing the most abuse stories at six per hour. Oprah Winfrey and Phil Donahue were least likely to disclose and they used more experts.

Springer said the talk shows are designed to reveal and surprise. He noted that participants volunteer to appear on the shows.

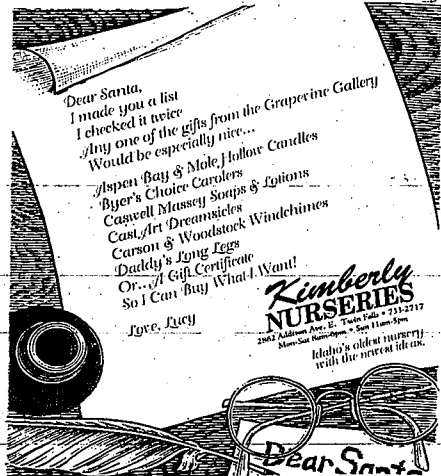
"My show in particular is about outrageous people and outrageous acts," he said in an interview Wednesday. "And unlike a show like '60 Minutes,' the people on talk shows want to be surprised."

Raphael argues that talk shows give young people an outlet to discuss their problems and to learn about issues such as AIDS, homosexuality, drug abuse and teen pregnancy.

"These shows are like morality plays," she said last month. "The audience always tells the bad people off — the young girls who are getting pregnant, the men who are abusing their wives, the women cheating on their husbands."

Most of the recent criticism stems from a talk show disclosure murder case. In March, a male guest on Jenny Jones' show was set up to meet a secret admirer and was humiliated when the admirer turned out to be a homosexual man. He was charged with murdering the admirer following the taping.

The incident led to some soul-searching within the industry and a talk show summit in New York last month.

**Panel OKs victim restitution proposal**

WASHINGTON — By a near-unanimous vote, the Senate Judiciary Committee approved a proposal Thursday that could compel criminals to compensate their victims in federal cases.

The committee voted, 15-1, to send the legislation to the full Senate. The bill would let victims of violent crime, fraud and product-tampering recover from the criminal their financial losses resulting from the act.

Only Sen. Paul Simon, D-Ill., voted against the measure. He said there were very good intentions behind it, but he was concerned that mandatory compensation of victims would put a big new burden on federal courts. "We're imposing a mandate on the federal judges. ... You should give flexibility to the judges," said Simon, who also opposes mandatory minimum sentences.

**Parkinson's disease won't slow Reno**

WASHINGTON — With medication controlling the shaking of her left hand, Attorney General Janet Reno says her newly diagnosed Parkinson's disease will neither force her from office nor cease her long weekend walks along the Potomac River.

"I feel fine now. I continue to take my long walks," the 57-year-old attorney general told her weekly news conference Thursday. "I don't feel like I have any impairment. I feel strong and feel like moving ahead."

Reno disclosed that she was diagnosed three weeks ago with the progressive disease that undermines muscle control. Doctors assured her that, like hundreds of thousands of other Americans with Parkinson's, she could continue working without impairment.

**GOP agrees to cap on student loans**

WASHINGTON — Republicans in Congress agreed Thursday to limit the government's direct lending program for college students, a move Democrats contend will enrich bankers at the expense of 1.9 million students.

The agreement, which is part of the GOP bill that would balance the budget by 2003, would save \$1.6 billion over seven years by limiting the program to 10 percent of all student loans. The House initially wanted to scrap the program altogether, while the Senate sought a 20 percent cap. Nancy Kassebaum, a Kansas Republican who has led Senate negotiators, said Congress never intended for the direct lending program to supplant guaranteed student loans, which are made through banks and other lenders.

This year, about 2.5 million students at 1,350 schools participate in the direct program, in which the Department of Education bypasses middlemen by making loans to the students.

# Experimental drug successfully fights AIDS virus in monkeys

WASHINGTON (AP) — An experimental drug prevented monkeys from catching the AIDS virus even when the virus was pumped directly into their bodies, prompting hope the medicine could one day protect people.

The monkeys were completely protected even when the virus was in their blood for 24 hours before they got the drug, a discovery "too good to believe," said chief researcher Dr. Che-Chung Tsai of the University of Washington Regional Primate Center. But repeated tests came up with the same result.

It's a long way from a monkey drug to one

that will help people, but in today's edition of the journal Science, Tsai calls PMPA the most promising candidate yet to help people ward off the AIDS virus. And its maker, Gilead Sciences Inc., hopes to begin testing the drug in people next year.

"Such complete protection with no toxicity is unprecedented in the monkey model of AIDS and suggests a potential role for

fails to protect them. PMPA is a chemical very similar to AZT. Both attack the AIDS virus by blocking a key protein it needs to reproduce. But while AZT has to wait until a cell is totally infected to begin fighting the virus, PMPA can start waging war immediately. This type of drug is called a nucleotide analog, and no such medicine is yet on the market.

To see how well it worked, Tsai gave 35 monkeys 100 percent infectious doses of SIV, the primate version of HIV. Fifteen monkeys got injections of PMPA 48 hours

before they were exposed to AIDS, five got PMPA shots four hours after they were exposed and another five were treated 24 hours later. They all received PMPA intravenously for four weeks.

Eight months later, none of the treated animals is infected with SIV and none has experienced any side effects.

The 10 monkeys that didn't get PMPA shots became infected.

"It's definitely an exciting finding," said Gilead chemist Norbert Bischofberger. "But what this ultimately means to AIDS patients in the clinic remains to be seen."

## Study links Medicaid, death rate

NEW YORK (AP) — AIDS patients hospitalized for what looks like a common HIV-related pneumonia are far more likely to die in the hospital if they're using Medicaid rather than private insurance, a study says.

If budget cuts contemplated for Medicaid take effect, "this will only get worse," said researcher Dr. Charles Bennett.

The study involved 890 patients from 56 hospitals in Chicago, Los Angeles and Miami. After taking differences in patient demographics, illness severity and hospital characteristics into account, it found that the Medicaid patients were 73 percent more likely to die in the hospital than were patients with private insurance.

The Medicaid patients were about 40 percent less likely to receive a definitive test to see if they really had pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, called PCP, Bennett and co-authors report.

As a result, they ran a higher risk of being treated for PCP while actually having a different cause of their symptoms, and the failure to treat their real disease may explain their higher death rate, Bennett said. Tuberculosis and viral or bacterial infections can cause symptoms that mimic PCP, he said.

The diagnostic test is called bronchoscopy, in which a tube is inserted into a lung to recover a sample of tissue or lung fluid for laboratory analysis. Low Medicaid reimbursement rates for bronchoscopy may explain why Medicaid patients got this test less often, Bennett said.

Researchers cited a 1990 paper reporting that New York doctors received \$700 for doing a bronchoscopy on a patient with private insurance vs. \$70 for a Medicaid patient. The new PCP study used hospital records from 1987 to 1990.

Bennett is an associate professor of medicine at the Northwestern University Medical School and senior research associate at the Lakeside Veterans Affairs Hospital in Chicago.

The study is published in the November issue of the American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine.

"The decision not to perform a diagnostic procedure, the results of which may influence survival, is unconscionable," Dr. Philip Hopewell, president-elect of the American Thoracic Society, the medical section of the American Lung Association, said in a statement.

## Noted author Finney dies of pneumonia

GREENBRAE, Calif. (AP) — Jack Finney, author of "The Body Snatchers" which was turned into a cult film classic and the hugely popular time travel novel "Time and Again," has died of pneumonia. He was 84.

Finney died Tuesday at Marin General Hospital, said hospital spokeswoman Paula Avirett.

Though his name was not well-known to most filmgoers, Finney wrote several books that were made into motion pictures, including "Five Against the House," "Good Neighbor Sam," "House of Numbers" and "Assault on a Queen."

"Time and Again," which appeared in 1970, attracted little attention at first but gradually developed a wide following. It's the story, complete with carefully researched detail and touching romance, about a 20th century New Yorker who travels back to the 1880s. Though it was never made into a movie, plans for both a film and a play have been discussed.

A sequel, "From Time to Time," was published this year; in it, the hero is sent back to 1912.

"The Body Snatchers," his second book, became the 1956 film "Invasion of the Body Snatchers" that starred Kevin McCarthy and Dana Wynter.

### In teen's tragic end, a warning for parents

In Jerome, a baby soon will begin life amid a family's grief over a grandmother who died for no good reason.

In Meridian, a mother mourns a son she describes as "sweet," despite his many brushes with authority.

It's a cautionary tale for parents of teen-agers. Kids get mixed up, they have problems; they get into minor scrapes with the law. Nobody expects these little incidents to lead to tragedy, but sometimes they do.

Thirteen-year-old Michael L. Sandoval of Meridian was boy with problems. He'd had a string of disciplinary troubles at school, and conflicts with other kids. Never anything serious, according to his mom. But this fall, he took a gun to school and threatened another boy. He was expelled.

Finally, facing a court hearing on the gun incident, he took his parents' ear and hit the road for California. The trip ended in Oregon. Fleeing from police, he ran head-on into a car driven by Sharon Lee Eitzen, a retired schoolteacher from Roseburg. She was on her way to Jerome for the birth of her grandchild.

Thus does one teen-ager's rebellion bring grief to at least three towns. To both families, we offer our heartfelt condolences. If we also could make sense of the deaths, we would. We cannot.

Teen-agers, especially those of junior-high age, are fragile and unpredictable. Raging with hormones, un-

sure of their place in society, growing to adult size while ruled by immature judgment, they are desperately in need of caring adults. Yet they often push away the adults who care about them.

Kids not much different from Michael Sandoval are in every community. One may be in your home. They get into trouble now and then—nothing serious, yet. But they are capable, on short notice, of doing something dumb enough to get themselves killed.

Maybe nobody could have done anything to catch Michael Sandoval before he fell. It's certainly too late now. But for the kids like him, no effort to help is too much.

Teen-agers need adults who will talk to them, and listen to them. They need positive activities, such as sports, church and clubs.

More than anything, they need role models who won't disappoint them: parents, teachers, neighbors, public officials, entertainers, sports stars and ordinary people who pass on the street. Always, we adults should ask ourselves, "Am I demonstrating responsible behavior for the young eyes that watch me?"

Whatever brings a young person to success or tragedy is a complicated, unpredictable recipe. Once it's done, we can never know what might have happened if circumstances had been a little different. We can only do the best we can.

## Time to get serious about cutting taxes, spending

Just before the government "shutdown" at midnight Tuesday, Treasury Secretary Robert Rubin observed: "This is no way to run a country." He's right, but for the wrong reasons.

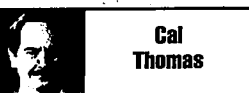
The Democrats are out of ideas, so they are engaging in deceit. The time has come to be honest about our addiction to taxing and spending. As a way of life is changed, some discomfort will result to the ultimate benefit of all, including the temporarily discomfited. As usual, President Clinton is trying to have it both ways — all gain and no pain. He wants us to believe he can disguise the "heroism" of deficit spending and ever-higher debt behind pious figures and unworkable promises designed to persuade us "addicts" that we are breaking the government dependency cycle when, in fact, we are merely adjusting the dosage. His tactics are scare and dare, and government by polling, not leadership. It's mourning in America.

Some years ago, my wife and I committed ourselves to reducing our personal debt. We agreed to stop charging items on our credit cards and pay cash for new purchases, while paying down our debt. We also learned financial discipline. The experience also taught us that debt is as much a drag on economic health as excess body weight is a drag on personal health. We vowed to remain in control of our finances, not let debt control us.

The demagoguery and posturing by Democrats notwithstanding, no one is going to be allowed to starve or die in the streets from an untreated ailment, and our grandmothers won't be expelled from nursing homes.

our if they perceived the U.S. government might default on its loans proved untrue.

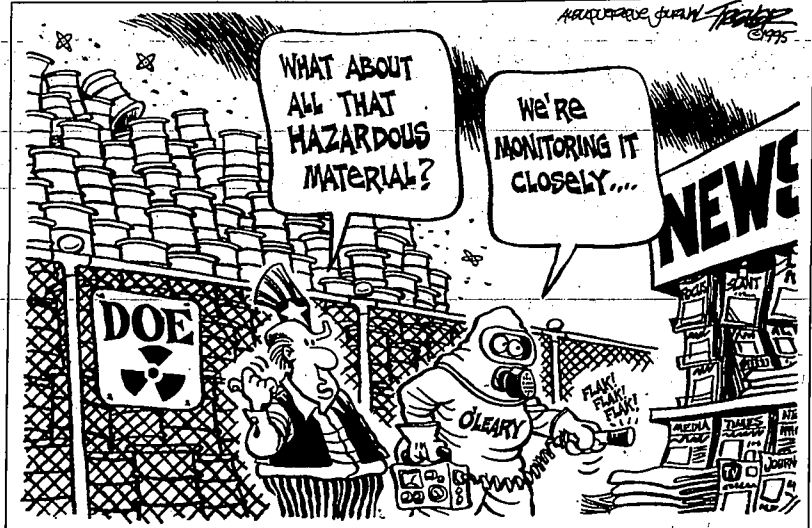

# Working class Russians wary of reform

VLADIMIR, Russia (AP) — Valentina Ivanova remembers not long ago when her life in this drab factory town still had a little class, and poverty was something she thought only workers in the West had to fear.

"I used to make 100 rubles a month. I went to the theater, went to the movies," recalled Ivanova, who works at the Vladimir Tractor Factory. "Now I don't make enough to put sugar on the table every day for my two kids."

For Ivanova, the not so distant Soviet past seems like Paradise Lost — a time when there wasn't much, but there was always something. A time when she didn't always feel like what she really is — a working-class mom eking out a living in a provincial city with no savings and few prospects.

It is this slide into the world of the real proletariat that is turning more and more people "back" to the Communist Party or turning off interest in the Dec. 17 parliamentary elections.

In the race to create a market economy, the government failed to halt an inflation tsunami that gutted workers' paychecks even as stores suddenly brimmed with merchandise and the lines vanished.

In the short term, more reform means more pain for workers in old state industries as Russia's new capitalists streamline. Recent success in curbing inflation is too late for many workers — their savings already are gone.

In working class towns like Vladimir, layoffs, unpaid wages and falling living standards are a way of life and cloud the memories so many Russians hold of the Soviet era with

its poorly stocked shops, shabby goods and long lines.

The resentment many Russian workers feel is not so apparent in Moscow and St. Petersburg, where support for reform among wealthy businessmen and the urban intelligentsia is still strong.

Few workers in Vladimir seem to believe the elections will change their lives for the better.

"I'm fed up. These elections, well, they happen all the time and nothing gets better," said Nikolai Petrov, a middle-aged truck driver. "There are so many parties, so many candidates. It's hard to figure out."

Petrov says he won't vote. Those Russians who will vote must choose

from a dizzying list of more than 40 parties and thousands of candidates.

"None of those parties interest me," said Vasil Bobrik, who has worked as a welder at the Vladimir Tractor Factory for 40 years. "They make only empty promises."

Vladimir, a 12th century Russian city 100 miles northeast of Moscow, ought to be a reform stronghold, a symbol of Russia's success in building democracy and capitalism.

Mayor Igor Shamov, a Yeltsin appointee with impeccable reform credentials, has pushed through changes despite a Communist majority in the City Council in the four years since the Soviet collapse.

The Vladimir Tractor Factory,

once a showcase of Soviet industry, has been entirely privatized. Its director studied at Harvard. The head of the World Bank just visited, and U.S. tractor company Case says it wants to invest.

But the workers have not harvested the fruits of the reform, and even those who have no use for the old regime are confused by the country's crazy politics and anxious about losing their jobs.

The tractor factory laid off 900 of its 10,500 workers this month. Deputy Director Vladimir Filatov said another 2,100 employees will be axed by spring if local or regional governments don't come up with cheap credits.

Such cutbacks are a painful reminder of the time when all Soviet citizens were guaranteed a job.

"I didn't like them. To tell the truth, I hated the Communists, but for crying out loud we lived better then," Bobrik, the welder, said.

The inflation unleashed by Boris Yeltsin's reforms forced Bobrik, who had retired in 1992, to don his welder's mask again. He couldn't survive on his \$49 monthly pension, the equivalent of four bus trips to Moscow.

The average wage at the tractor factory is \$75 a month, barely above the official subsistence — or poverty — level of \$64 a month.

Finding a better job elsewhere is difficult. The factory is the city's biggest and one of its best-paying employers.

Nearby cities and towns are even worse off than Vladimir, a city of 340,000 people. In neighboring Ivanovo region, top-heavy in textile plants, there are 94 contenders for every job posted.

### Tourist kicked off flight over donkey

CAIRO, Egypt — A Polish tourist tried to carry a baby donkey onto his flight home Thursday, saying he didn't have the \$800 it costs to transport the animal in the cargo hold.

Airport officials told him no bray. The tourist, identified as Poleskie Birgecki, 39, said he bought the donkey for \$350 as a pet. He plans sell it and return to Poland next week. Cairo International officials said.

### South Africa issues crime warning

CAPE TOWN, South Africa — Police are distributing pamphlets at South African airports with tips for tourists on how to protect themselves against rampant crime.

The initiative follows a series of attacks against foreign tourists, including the brutal assault of four youths from Britain and New Zealand on a remote road in the Eastern Cape province. Last week, 12 tourists were mugged or robbed in central Cape Town.

### Georgia cracks down on terrorist acts

TBILISI, Georgia — Georgia's top prosecutor said fear of a second attack prompted authorities to arrest a Georgian warlord in connection with the August car bombing that almost killed President Eduard Shevardnadze.

"It was a dangerous time. We had information that another terrorist action was being prepared," Gamlet Bablashvili, Georgia's prosecutor general, told Georgia's election commission Thursday.

Dzhaba Ioseliani, a deputy in Georgia's parliament, was arrested Wednesday. Georgia's Central Electoral Commission has protested the arrest, saying legislators are immune from prosecution.

### Nigerian executions prompt reprisal

STRASBOURG, France — The European Parliament demanded tougher EU sanctions against Nigeria Thursday, asking for an oil embargo to punish its military rulers for executing nine human rights activists.

But the EU's executive commission said Thursday it will not consider any new sanctions until it sees whether milder measures it already approved have any effect.

On Wednesday, EU diplomats approved a total arms embargo against Nigeria and tight restrictions on granting visas to Nigerian officials. Earlier, it cut off economic aid and withdrew its ambassadors.

Nigeria's economy is heavily dependent on oil, and oil products account for more than 90 percent of Nigeria's exports to the EU.

# Israel's president says 'perhaps' he's a chauvinist

JERUSALEM (AP) — In a frank television interview, Israeli President Ezer Weizman admitted that "perhaps" he is a chauvinist but said he didn't mean to offend when he called a female soldier "missy."

The soldier, Alice Miller, recently won her case to be able to become the first woman permitted to apply for Israel's elite fighter pilot training program.

She had written to Weizman asking for his help in her case, and during a phone call he called her "Maedele" — Yiddish for "missy" — and asked her if she had ever seen a man darning socks.

"I don't know why she should be insulted that I call her 'Maedele,'" he said, but added: "I no longer use the term."

Asked by the interviewer if he

was a chauvinist, Weizman replied "Perhaps, perhaps."

"I think there is some criticism I need to take to heart, and I will take it to heart," he said. "What more do they want from me?"

Weizman, 72, entered politics as a hawk after an illustrious military career as a fighter pilot and general, then switched to the more dovish Labor party and became an outspo-

ken advocate of making peace with the Palestinians.

In the past year, however, he has come under attack for his blunt criticism of the late Yitzhak Rabin's peace agreements with the Palestinians.

"I thought the pace was too fast," he said in the interview broadcast Wednesday night. "I felt duty-bound to say so."

# Abuses reported in Mexico

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Amnesty International accused Mexico of decades of human rights violations and a persistent failure to prosecute abuses in a report the Mexican government says "exaggerates the facts."

The London-based human rights group said it found evidence that people are arrested without court orders, tortured in police custody and forced to sign confessions. In many cases, the confessions are the only evidence used against them in court, the group said in a report.

"Based on our investigations in the last year, we have been able to verify a growing number of denunciations of grave human rights violations, in particular extra-judicial executions... against members of the (political) opposition," Morris Tibball, an Amnesty International forensic expert told a news conference Wednesday.

Mexico's Foreign Relations Ministry issued a statement late Wednesday saying the report exaggerated violations.

It called the accusations "a difference in perceptions" based on "magnification of facts in Amnesty International's reports," but said it was willing to investigate.

The recommendations in the report were submitted more than a year ago to then-President-elect Ernesto Zedillo, Amnesty's deputy secretary general Derek Evans said. Zedillo took office Dec. 1, but Amnesty International said it has not yet received a response.

The report contains 17 recommendations, including eliminating authorities' right to hold suspects incommunicado for up to 48 hours, strict rules for interrogation and prohibiting the use of confessions obtained through torture.

Amnesty International also called for greater protection of human rights workers, compensation for victims of torture, and full investigation into cases of disappeared people.

Zedillo has promised to protect human rights and turn Mexico into a nation that has "strict adherence to the law." Nevertheless, a pattern of systematic abuse by authorities has continued, the report said.

"Despite the adoption in recent years of legal and administrative measures for the protection of human rights, incidents continue to be reported on an alarming scale throughout the country," Evans said.

The report alleges abuses by the federal army in the southern state of Chiapas in February against rebels of the Zapatista National Liberation Army, attacks against opposition political activists and human rights workers, and what it calls injustices against Indians and illegal immigrants and political violence in the southwestern state of Guerrero.

# Pope backs peace talks for Bosnia

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Negotiators near Dayton, Ohio, trying to end the Bosnian war are in the pope's thoughts.

Speaking to Macedonia's new ambassador to the Holy See, John Paul II said Thursday he hopes the talks "will bring a prompt and lasting solution to the horrific violence that has plagued the Balkans for the past four years."

The pontiff also praised the "climate-of-understanding" favoring cooperation among churches in the former Yugoslav republic. Parties in the Bosnian war are divided along religious fault lines. The Serbs are mainly Orthodox, and Croats Roman Catholic.

### Filer approves levy for technology center

FILER — Filer voters approved a two-year \$550,000 supplemental levy Thursday by six votes.

In the election, 332 voted for the proposal and 325 said no.

The money will go for an agricultural science and industrial technology center at the new Filer High School.

Construction on the building can start immediately and should be completed by next fall.

"I knew it would be real close," said David Ramseyer, chairman of the Filer school board. "But I didn't expect it to be this close."

Ramseyer said he was surprised and pleased by the result and does not expect it to be challenged even though spending issues have divided the community.

The 11,000-square-foot center was part of the original plans for \$5.52 million in bond revenues approved in 1994, but was axed after construction delays and the hiring of a consultant raked up higher-than-expected costs.

Voters last approved a levy in 1993 — \$75,000 for a computer lab and music and science programs.

### Morningside teacher honored for cable classroom project

TWIN FALLS — Julie Blank, a teacher at Morningside Elementary School, was honored Thursday for her Cable in the Classroom project.

Copinnacle Cablevision presented the 1995 Cable in the Classroom Innovation Award to Blank during a ceremony held in the school library. Blank's project was titled "Kingdom." She received a \$500 savings bond.

### Canal company will see no increase in assessments

TWIN FALLS — Higher operating costs faced by the Twin Falls Canal Co. are being balanced by greater operating efficiencies, so company shareholders will not see an increase in 1996 assessments.

Next year's assessments have been pegged at \$19.50 per share, which is the same amount shareholders paid this year, according to a prepared statement from the company's board of directors.

The board's stated goal is to provide good service at the lowest possible cost, while continuing to maintain, repair and upgrade the canal system.

### BLM seeks information on theft of wheatgrass seed

HAGERMAN — Anyone with information about the theft of 30 bags of crested wheatgrass seed from a trailer 13 miles west of Bell Rapids, can earn a \$500 reward from the Bureau of Land Management.

The seed, valued at \$1,300, was in white bags with a blue certification label. It was destined to rehabilitate part of the 32,000-acre Twin Buttes fire area; the 30 bags were enough to re-seed about 1,300 acres.

Certified seed has been in short supply this year because of extensive fire rehabilitation projects across southwestern Idaho.

### Youth Alternative Court becomes popular in valley

JEROME — A program in which teenagers sentence their peers for underage smoking and drinking is spreading across the Magic Valley.

Youth Alternative Court is starting up in Blaine, Gooding, Lincoln, Cassia and Minidoka counties, said Trish Borresen, coordinator of the program. The program began this year in Jerome and Twin Falls counties.

Under the program, students ages 10 to 17 volunteer as jurors, defendants, prosecutors and defense attorneys.

The defendants, all first-time offenders, must have pleaded guilty to the crimes in court. Defendants later become jurors.

Punishments for smoking or drinking typically range from 1,500 word presentations to their class to picking up cigarette butts, Borresen said.

The program is nationwide and serves as an educational alternative to adult courts, she said.

## Jerome funeral delayed as birth news

JEROME — A Jerome family will welcome a new baby any day now and then hold a funeral for the child's grandmother.

Sharon L. Eitzen, 59, of Roseburg, Ore., died Tuesday in a head-on-highway collision as she traveled to Jerome to visit her pregnant daughter, Sandra Thibault.

A 13-year-old runaway boy from Meridian also died in the crash near LuPine, Ore., after he apparently swerved into Eitzen's path — perhaps to pass another vehicle, or perhaps in a suicide bid, police said. The boy was fleeing criminal charges for bringing a gun to his school.

Eitzen's funeral hasn't been planned yet because Thibault is likely to give birth very soon, said Don McCormack of Roseburg, a close friend of Eitzen's.

Also, Thibault had difficulty contacting a sister overseas with news of the death, McCormack said.

The sister is employed by the Seattle School District and is on a month-long assignment in Thailand.

Eitzen's remains will be cremated, and a service will be held in two or three weeks, McCormack said.

Thibault is married to Kent Thibault. Her mother-in-law, Phyllis Thibault of Jerome, said news of Eitzen's death "was traumatic" for Sandra Thibault. The crash made headlines and TV newscasts in Roseburg and Boise.

The tragedy began Tuesday morning when a motorist called state police to complain about a reckless driver. Michael Sandoval and Michael Coen, 14 of Meridian, had pulled out of a rest stop near

Riley, Ore., on U.S. 20 about 80 miles east of Bend. One of the car's tires was a miniature spare tire not designed to go faster than 45 mph.

Police tried to pull over the car in Bend, but backed off when it drove the wrong way up a one-way street and sideswiped another vehicle.

"Police tried three times to break off pursuit in the hope that this kid would slow down, but he wouldn't," said state police Lt. Ron Nelson.

South of Bend on U.S. Highway 97, officers laid out a strip of spikes designed to blow out the tires of the speeding car. But Sandoval drove around it.

Officers were setting up another spike strip farther down the highway, but before Sandoval reached it he swerved into Eitzen's car.

Officers pulled Coen out of the wreckage at gunpoint. He suffered some cuts to his face and was treated at a Bend hospital.

Eitzen had taught computers and English at Cottonberry Junior High School in Myrtle Creek until last year.

Sandoval was expelled Oct. 9 for bringing an unloaded handgun to Meridian Middle School and showing it off.

Facing a juvenile court hearing, Sandoval took his mother's car and headed for California, talking his buddy into coming along.

Eitzen, meanwhile, was reportedly traveling with a puppy; after the accident, police said a small dog ran from her car. A young voice on a telephone answering machine at Eitzen's home asks callers to leave information about "our lost dog, Molly."

## School eyes money for next year

JEROME — The Jerome School District's economic climate is clouding up, with the possibility of a storm up ahead.

If expenses continue "We could end up with a negative \$37,000 at the end of this fiscal year," said Mike Gibson, business manager.

To ease the strain of the shortage, funds could be taken from reserve funds, he said.

"Also, Gov. Phil Batt is talking about a holdback (of state funds) that could mean we'd have a \$189,000 negative balance," Gibson said.

"There is a possibility of legislators coming up with rainy day funds, or the state superintendent has the power to levy locally," said Jim Cobble, Jerome superintendent.

Using reserve funds to balance this year's budget would result in having about \$400,000 left to start the next year, Gibson said. "That would only be enough for about one-half of a month's expenses — we like to have enough for an entire month or about \$800,000 in reserve," he said.

The budget was prepared based on projected student enrollment that didn't materialize as predicted. "We can predict, but we can't prophesy. We staffed up to anticipated requirements," Gibson said.

Enrollment in the first and sixth grades and at the high school has been less than projected when teachers were hired in April, Cobble said. School funding is received from the state based on attendance.

"This is the worst-case scenario," Cobble said.

In other business, the school board:

• Must plan to walk through the newly completed vocational-agriculture technology building at the high school. "Classes should begin after the Thanksgiving break," Cobble said. The College of Southern Idaho is working on telecommunications hook-ups and educational opportunities, he said.

• Discussed making the Internet available to Jerome students. An improved filter system will give better control of "what comes in."

"We want the parents to know we'll do everything we can, but we can't filter all of it. There are from 1,000 to 1,500 sites coming on per day, and there's no way we can keep up with that. Parents, you're kids being responsible enough to handle that?" asked board trustee Eric Steigers.

• Unanimously approved a report of accomplishments resulting from a technology grant of \$20,000 used this year for computers and accessories. Attendance at the recent Idaho School Board Association meetings "made me feel we are really up to par with the number of computers we have. We are leaders in that field," said Board Chairwoman Nancy Churchillman.

• Decided to renew the school plant facilities levy that expires in 1997.

## Rural family builds home

KIMBERLY — Terry Tillotson changed full-time jobs three months ago so his family — including his 13-year-old diabetic son, Ben — could have health insurance. Susan Tillotson just started a different part-time job so she could be home with their five youngest children after school.

And the rural Kimberly couple is working with Habitat for Humanity of the Magic Valley to build and finance a house big enough for their family.

In just the past few months, the Tillotsons have started to rebuild their lives.

"We've had a couple of setbacks, but I don't think there's anything too bad to overcome," said Susan Tillotson. The Bull native has seven children, five of whom still live at home.

While helping build the third Habitat home for Beverly Hayes, Susan Tillotson's friend, the Tillotsons were selected as Habitat's fourth family. They must spend 250 hours working on someone else's home and doing other volunteer work for Habitat, as well as work at least 250 hours on their own home.

The Tillotsons will get a no-interest mortgage on the house, which will be built next year with donated or discounted materials and donated labor.

"They're not giving it to me," 37-year-old Susan Tillotson said. "They're giving me a chance to work for it and pay for it."

"It gives you a sense of accomplishment and pride. You have an opportunity to help build, and you pay for something that you're building. You feel better to provide for your children with a larger house."

Habitat probably won't start the Tillotsons' house at least until spring, said Habitat board member and fund-raising chairman Kristy Webb.

Habitat had six lots off of Blake Street on Fourth Avenue West and DeLong Avenue, and houses have been built on the three Fourth Avenue lots. About \$20,000 needs to be raised to install sewer, water, curbing and gutters for the three remaining Habitat lots before the Tillotson house is started, Webb said.

Habitat also is selecting new board members, who will need to be familiarized with those positions, and is helping form a chapter in Jerome, Webb said.

"I'm probably looking at another year down the road. It's worth the wait," Susan Tillotson said. "It's still hard for me to believe it's real."

Right now, the Tillotsons are paying \$300 to rent a house that is listed as having two bedrooms. The Tillotsons turned it into a three bedroom house, yet they still have four bunk beds in one room.

"We just need more room," Susan Tillotson said.

Finding an affordable rental that allows numerous children is difficult, Susan

## Defeated Shoshone councilman to resign

SHOSHONE — Defeated City Councilman Joe Anderson offered to resign Wednesday night during the council meeting.

Anderson, who was beaten at the polls in the Nov. 7 election by J.R. Churchman, said he would step aside and let "R. take over." In other action, the council canvassed the votes from last Tuesday election and declared incumbent Dale Sluder and J.R. Churchman as winners of the two City Council seats that were open

The council also heard from Police Chief Chuck Cox who said he was "up to his armpits" in cases. He cited 10 cases of domestic violence, five assaults, five cases of vandalism, two child abuse reports, three child neglect cases, and four disturbing the peace calls, in his report to the council.

Cox said four dog complaints that were also reported to his office were of dogs that had been reported numerous times in the past. The dog problem was permanently resolved, he said.

A large number of stolen rifles were recovered last week, Cox said. A suspect was arrested and jailed after an investigator located the weapons in a Twin Falls pawn shop, he said.

## Lawmakers suggest hike in registration

BOISE — A legislative committee will recommend that the next Legislature increase the state fuel tax by 4 cents per gallon next year, with a 50 percent increase in vehicle registration fees in 1997.

But even after months of meetings and statewide hearings, it came to that conclusion only reluctantly late Thursday, after battling through a number of plans that were defeated or got no support.

"It's like eating elephants — one bite at a time," said Rep. Dave Bliven, R-Meridian, after the committee had to take separate votes on every aspect of its recommendations.

The committee listened to months of testimony that more money is needed for highway and bridge maintenance and construction. But it couldn't agree how to do it. The recommendations it produced generally fit in with Gov. Phil Batt's views on how to fund the highway needs.

Batt has said he supports the concept of increasing revenue for roads, although he was waiting to see what the Legislature produces.



Despite all the work, members of the committee acknowledged that the proposals face a big job getting through the Legislature.

Highlights:

• The Legislature and Batt approve the tax on gas and diesel will go up May 1 by 4 cents per gallon to 25 cents. That would raise about \$25 million per year in extra revenue.

• The registration increase calls for a 50 percent jump effective in 1997. The lowest registration fee, now \$16 for vehicles seven years or older, would go to \$24 with the top fee increasing to \$48.

• All the new revenue must go toward actual highway and bridge construction and repair.

The new revenue will go 50 percent to the Idaho Transportation Department and 50 percent divided between counties,

counties and highway districts.

If the fuel tax goes up 4 cents per gallon, a motorist driving 10,000 miles per year in a vehicle getting 20 miles per gallon will pay an extra \$20 per year.

"Twigs told city, county and highway district lobbyists at the meeting, that they'd better support the effort to get the extra revenue."

He said he didn't want them to go around blaming the Legislature for raising travel costs, but still taking the extra money.

Earlier, the panel directed the Transportation Department to trim 100 jobs over the next three years, a move expected to save \$4.2 million in annual salary and fringe benefits. Lawmakers said the other agencies receiving the new revenue would be expected to make their own cost-cutting moves.

Sen. Evan Frazier of Pocatello, co-chairman of the study panel and head of the Senate Transportation Committee, said it appears the revenue proposals will have a harder time getting through the more conservative House. He said they will be sent first to the House Transportation Committee.

# Japan seeks advice on wolf plan

When Japan began modernizing early this century, American advisers helped the Japanese government eradicate native wolves. Now, American advisers are helping officials form a plan to reintroduce wolves there in part to help thin the population of Sika deer, which has grown to high levels in the absence of one of the deer's main predators.

Rick McIntyre, a National Park Service naturalist, recently traveled to Japan to speak to the Japan Wolf-Association on the U.S. government's wolf reintroduction program in central Idaho and Yellowstone National Park. During his visit, he toured Nikko

and Shiretoko national parks. In Nikko, which is just two hours north of Tokyo, we saw hundreds and hundreds of deer," he said. "The damage to vegetation was very evident."

McIntyre said Japanese officials are developing plans to capture wolves in northwestern China if a reintroduction plan is approved. "They are very enthusiastic about reintroducing wolves, and become even more so when I told them about the economic boost business experience from park visitors coming to see wolves," he said.

He said while much of the opposition to the U.S. government's reintroduction program came from ranchers concerned that wolves

would kill livestock, many Japanese are concerned about their own safety.

"There needs to be about a decade of education about predators because the Japanese grew up on the same European fairy tales we did — Little Red Riding Hood and all — and human safety is one of their main concerns," he said.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service early this year transplanted 29 wolves from Alberta, Canada, to Yellowstone and central Idaho. Officials are making plans to bring more wolves from Canada early next year.

The release of the wolves culminated about two decades of talks on the issue.

# Education board approves expanded testing program

BOISE (AP) — A divided state Board of Education has approved the expanded program of standardized testing in Idaho public schools already being implemented by state schools Superintendent Anne Fox.

The testing program was expanded to fall from three grades to nine with \$500,000 appropriated by the 1995 Legislature. Fox is asking for another \$500,000 to continue putting the plan in place next year.

Thursday's Board of Education action came over objections from Idaho Education Association President Monica Beauodin and other teachers and school administrators. They argue that standardized testing in so many grades undermines local control of curricula, cuts into already limited classroom instruction time and ignores other ways to assess student progress.

"I strongly believe that half a million dollars can more validly be spent on the students of our state," Pocatello High School teacher Arlen Walker said. "The only people who profit from standardized tests are the ones who sell them."

Beauodin said so much focus on standardized testing might prompt teachers to move away from local curriculum priorities developed

over the years in favor of "teaching to the test."

She and others also objected to the possibility that test results could be used to compare districts around the state.

Board member Carole McWilliam of Pocatello agreed.

that a better choice might be developing tests for additional subjects like the writing and math assessments the state administrators.

Fox said she was "totally open to expanding and working in those areas." In fact, some work has started toward developing a science assessment. But that could take three years to complete and would cost more money.

Board member Dr. Thomas Dillon of Caldwell said Fox has a more immediate mandate from voters.

"The crux of the matter is that our state superintendent was elected

partly on the platform that there would be testing and there would be accountability," he said. "This board would not be doing what's right to deny the state superintendent what she was elected for."

However, he called for Fox to report back to the board in 18 months or so on how the expanded schedule of Tests of Achievement and Proficiency and Iowa Tests of Basic Skills has helped Idaho students.

Before this year, standardized tests were given to students in the fourth, eighth and 11th grades. School districts had the option of giving students a writing assessment in the fourth grade and math assessments in the fourth and eighth grades.

Now a complete battery of standardized tests is being administered each fall to students in the third, fifth, seventh and ninth grades. A shorter "survey battery" tests students in the fourth, sixth, eighth, 10th and 11th grades. In addition, writing assessments will be required and expanded in February to include writing assessments in the fourth, eighth and 11th grades.

Math assessments also will be required, but will still be taken only by fourth- and eighth-grade students.

## Research produces water measurement device

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Research at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory has produced a pressure detector to tell farmers how much water they need to irrigate their pipes.

The device originally was developed to measure the outflow of water in a nuclear reactor's cooling system. The new farm application will be assembled in Idaho Falls by a new company, ID Tech, an offshoot of the River Valley Electric Blackfoot irrigation equipment company.

Principal owner Terrel Kidd said it's becoming more important to

measure water consumed to make sure it matches a farmer's water rights.

"In Idaho, farmers have always enjoyed access to all the water they've needed," he said. "They never really had competing interests for the water. (But) people are starting to question whether agriculture is using more than it's entitled to."

He said increasing pressures from recreationists and urban development are about to force stricter control of water. He expects to set up the measuring devices for less than

Lockheed engineer Marcos Ortiz started work on the system about three years ago to test the safety of an advanced nuclear reactor design for power production. He and Lockheed will share royalties from their license to ID Tech.

"It represents the first example of a local company coming to us with a product need which we're able to connect with technology," said Tom Ulrich of Lockheed Martin's Technology Transfer Office.

## Suspect in plot once threatened Andrus' life

An Oklahoma man charged in a bomb conspiracy threatened the life of former Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus a year ago.

Ray Lampley, 65, did not make it clear in the letter to Andrus why he was threatening the governor's life other than making references to politicians who did not follow God's law and who supported health care reform, national identity cards and federal crime bills.

"What does Almighty God plan to do to this Nation and to your state during the next six months?" the letter asked. "Why are you going to be removed from office by force of arms and put to death? — Unless there are some real changes on your part, you will die."

A former aide to Andrus said the letter was referred to the Department of Law Enforcement and the Human Rights Commission and that nothing more apparently came of it.

Lampley, who signed the document "prophet of the most high" for the Universal Church of God in Hanna, Okla., was arrested last weekend with his 47-year-old wife. Two other men also are charged in a conspiracy to bomb civil rights centers, abortion clinics, welfare offices and gay bars.

Prosecutors say Lampley had the components to build a bomb at his McIntosh Oklahoma, Oklahoma, home when he was arrested last weekend.

Lampley's attorney said Thursday the key ingredient for the homemade bombs that Lampley is accused of conspiring to make was actually furnished by the federal informant who helped him in forming the group.

Lampley and the other chief conspirator, Larry Wayne Crow, allegedly told a militia group in South Dakota that they wanted to bomb four or five buildings.

# Officer Wardel wants to ward off crime in school

RUPERT — The new Minidoka County School District resource officer already keeps a growing file of newspaper clips depicting violent tragedy in Idaho's schools.

His job, James Wardel says, is to keep the six schools he covers from being added to that file.

"The potential is here. If people say there's not that big of a problem here, I say, 'No, not yet,'" said Wardel, a Minidoka County Sheriff's deputy who started patrolling Rupert-area schools on Nov. 1. "The potential exists anywhere. Hopefully, we're here in time to prevent anything like that."

Wardel is the school district's second resource officer, joining Steven Hobbs who has responded to criminal activity in the schools since January 1994. Wardel's position, primarily funded by money appropriated for "safe schools" in the legislature, became a necessity because of the heavy load of calls for Hobbs' services.

"Steve was busy. He had a lot to do," East Minico Junior High School Principal Dave Borden said. "And I think when you get really busy and all you have time to do is put out fires, you don't have time to mingle with the kids."

Based at his East Minico Junior High School office, Wardel makes certain he spends plenty of time getting to know students.

He is a visible presence in the hallways before and after classes, a

time when trouble can brew. Wardel's police service belt includes handcuffs, a radio, and a gun.

"I'm still a deputy. I still wear the badge. I carry (the gun) for my safety and the safety of the students," he said.

Student safety is becoming more and more of a concern in the school district, just as it is in others, Borden said.

Hobbs said he has seen offenses ranging from petty theft to rape and assault with guns and knives around school campuses.

Wardel, a father of three and graduate of the Minidoka County School system, helped school officials break up a confrontation between two students during lunch time at East Minico Tuesday. In just over two full weeks in the schools, Wardel said he has yet to see any serious problems.

"Maybe it's just because I'm here," he said. The new resource officer is based at East Minico because it is the only school with open office space, Wardel said. He also makes regular daily trips to Memorial, Big Valley, Pershing and Acaquia elementary schools, and the district's alternative school.

His presence, Wardel hopes, will act as a deterrent to criminal activity in the school. More than that, though, Wardel wants to become influential in preventing kids from becoming criminals. He is working with the school district on putting into classrooms programs - such as the Drug Abuse Resistance Education curriculum used in Cassia

County and Heyburn schools. "There's a lot of preventative maintenance that can be done here," Wardel said.

"The one thing I've really stressed to the kids is I'm not just here as a cop, I'm here, hopefully, as someone who can help you," he added.

# Ed Board approves policy for athletes

BOISE (AP) — The state Board of Education has given final approval to a policy requiring athletes at Idaho colleges and universities to report any criminal charges or convictions to their school and the board.

The policy endorsed on Thursday also requires athletes to disclose any criminal history, including juvenile charges or convictions that would have constituted a misdemeanor or felony if committed by an adult.

In addition, the policy bars coaches from knowingly recruiting any felony who has been convicted of a felony to be removed from the team.

The policy was developed after board members found they were the last to know about a number of cases in recent months involving athletes at all three Idaho universities who had been charged with or convicted of offenses including statutory rape, assault and battery, theft and resisting arrest.

Final board approval came over arguments from a Pocatello woman and a state lawmaker that the policy is discriminatory and leaves student-athletes no avenue for appeal when they are removed from a team.

"Are we here to punish athletes or are we here to try to make them better human beings in our community?" Lela Liggins asked the board via a television link with Pocatello.

She cited this fall's decision by Idaho State University officials to kick two black football players off the team shortly before they pleaded

guilty to misdemeanor battery charges. Both originally were charged with statutory rape for allegedly having consensual sex with 14-year-old girls.

Liggins — who also is black — said the Idaho State players were punished too severely by the university, and that the board policy of such cases should include an appeal provision.

She said she had attended the Pocatello school, but recently decided a grandchild should go elsewhere because of how other minority students had been treated.

Republican state Rep. James Luens of Moscow agreed that the policy "is clearly discriminatory." He urged board members to leave decisions on such cases entirely up to each college and university.

But board President Curtis Eaton of Twin-Falls said the policy only set uniform minimum standards, and each institution was free to do more.

# State help, limit keep taxes in Mini-Cassia down

BURLEY — Property tax notices have been sent out this month to home and land owners in the Mini-Cassia area — and the news is not all grim.

Local property taxes didn't increase as much as they might have and some decreased slightly.

The Legislature's 3 percent limit on property tax increases along with state help in financing public schools' maintenance and operation helped keep tax increases down, Cassia County assessor Martell Holland said.

Only owners whose property has been significantly under market value in the past will see a sizable increase, Holland said.

"If for some reason we found a home we hadn't seen for some time, they're going to have a significant higher tax bill this year," he said.

Minidoka and Cassia county treasurers say all tax levies imposed in all county zones are down slightly from last year, but that doesn't mean people will be paying less in property taxes.

Each case is different, depending on changes in property value and what projects taxing districts are financing, such as a new truck for a highway district.

Cassia County Treasurer Gayle Erickson said tax bills were sent out last week.

The assessed value of a \$166,000 home just east of Burley didn't change from last year, but the tax decreased from \$1,500 to \$1,500, she said.

The assessed value of a \$369,000 home east of Burley also remained the same, but the property tax decreased from \$4,200 to \$3,700, she said.

The market value of a \$23,800 home increased to \$26,000 this year, and its taxes decreased from \$553 to \$546, she said.

In Minidoka County, Treasurer Elaine White said property taxes on a home in a developing subdivision just outside of the northwest edge of town have increased over last year, along with the property value.

In 1992, the home was valued at \$74,900 and taxed at \$905, according to White's figures. The property value remained the same in 1993, but taxes decreased to \$896. The value increased last year to \$88,000 and taxes were raised to \$927. The value increased again this year to \$103,000 and taxes rose to \$987.

Minidoka County Assessor Max Vaughan said some property owners have the wrong impression that assessors inflate property values so taxing districts can collect more money. The assessor's job is to ensure that all property is assessed at market value so everyone pays a fair share of taxes, he said.

According to Holland, even if market values decrease, taxes can rise. During the 1980s home market values were falling, but taxing districts were spending more so taxes increased, he said.

Both treasurers encourage property owners to consider available tax exemptions. Applicants must apply between Jan. 1 and April 15.

### Boise Cascade official lands ISU post

POCATELLO — Theodore Crumley, senior vice president and chief financial officer of Boise Cascade Corp., has been named president of the Idaho State University Foundation.

Crumley's term will run for two years when he will be succeeded by President-elect Rich Garvin, senior vice president of First Security Bank in Pocatello.

Both men were named to the Idaho State Foundation board of directors in 1991.

### Minnick takes 3rd road on budget issue

BOISE — Blasting both sides in the budget impasse that has shut down portions of the federal government, Democratic senatorial candidate Walt Minnick on Thursday offered his own proposal for immediately financing the budget.

He called for up to a 10 percent cut in defense spending, immediate elimination of \$40 billion in ineffective programs, repeal of what he called some corporate welfare, gradual termination of natural resource subsidies, rejection of the GOP tax cut and limits on payments to Americans earning \$50,000 a year or more.

"We have career politicians on both sides of the fence who are behaving like adolescents," Minnick said in a statement.

### Icy road leads to Idaho man's death

WARM LAKE — A southeastern Idaho man died when the commercial truck he was driving plumed off an icy highway and down an embankment near central Idaho's Warm Lake.

The Valley County Sheriff's Department identified the victim of the Wednesday evening accident as Joseph Valentine, 34, of Soda Springs.

Authorities said Valentine was thrown from the vehicle.

### Former contractor faces prison time

COEUR D'ALENE — Former northern Idaho contractor Ron Stratton faces the possibility of a long prison sentence and stiff fines on Dec. 22 when he is sentenced on eight criminal counts of taking money for he never intended to do.

Stratton, 43, pleaded guilty Monday to eight counts of grand theft by false promise. Kootenai County Prosecutor Bill Douglas said there were no deals made.

"It's a straight-up guilty plea on all counts," he said. If he gets the maximum on all counts, Stratton faces up to 112 years in prison and \$40,000 in fines.

State and local officials said they received numerous complaints that Stratton took money in advance for construction jobs, then never finished the work. Stratton claimed he planned to finish all the work, but overextended himself.

### Corps wants to drop Dworshak level

LEWISTON — Nearly a week of rain in the Clearwater River drainage caught the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers with its turbines down.

That sent Dworshak Reservoir's level surging upward by nine feet. Dworshak Dam may start spilling water to continue a maintenance project which is currently under way.

Too few turbines in operation at Little Goose Dam downstream on the Snake River led the Corps to store water behind Dworshak Dam, when heavy rains started appearing last week.

The rising water level shut down work at the foundation of the Dworshak Dam to seal cracks in the bedrock, a leak that was bothersome but not a safety hazard, Corps officials said. The agency drew Dworshak's level down to 100 feet below full in October to reduce the amount of water leaking from the cracks to make the grouting easier.

### Mine worries Sandpoint residents

SANDPOINT — The majority of people attending a Sandpoint public hearing on a proposed Montana mine fear it will eventually spill pollution into the Clark Fork River and Idaho's Lake Pend Oreille.

A crowd of about 350 gathered Wednesday to discuss a draft environmental impact statement for ASARCO's proposed Rock Creek silver and copper mine near Nixson, Mont.

ASARCO officials want to excavate about 10,000 tons of ore a day from 15,000 feet underground, a mine they say would be in operation for the next 30 years.

"This project would be irresponsible toward the web of life," said Bob Ward, a Sandpoint resident who quoted the books of Job and Genesis.

## Prisons to prohibit cigarettes

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Board of Corrections has decided to ban smoking in prisons one year from now, and all new prison buildings will be smoke-free immediately.

The ban applies to prison staffs as well as the 3,000 prison inmates. All forms of tobacco are banned, including chewing tobacco. The warden of the Idaho State Correctional Institution at Boise, Joe Klausner, said it will be tough.

"A very high percentage of this population smokes," he said.

Earlier this month, the corrections board decided on the ban, although there was no public notice of the Nov. 3 decision. Klausner said rumor had it that the ban would be imposed as of Wednesday, so it came as something of a relief that it still is 12 months away.

"They have a year to think about it," he said.

The American Cancer Society's Great American Smokeout, when millions of smokers nationwide were to quit for 24 hours, was on Thursday. Gov. Phil Batt held a news conference Tuesday to proclaim the smokeout, and said he was pleased with the prison smoking ban.

"They're charged with keeping their prisoners healthy," the governor said. "I'm supporting it."

Corrections Director James Spaulding said the department is concerned about skyrocketing health care costs for inmates, along with complaints from staffs required to work in smoke-laden environments.

Spaulding has a committee working on putting the ban in effect. It will consider counseling and events such as stop-smoking classes.

Utah has made its prisons tobacco-free, Spaulding said, and Oregon will do so Jan. 1. "It's the trend," he said.

American Cancer Society volunteers Kim Peterson and Charles Schmidt were thrilled.

"Anything that can be done to help people quit smoking is very, very important," Schmidt said.

Spaulding said some prisons already are smoke-free, including the new women's facility at Pocatello.

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — A jury has found in favor of a former state Transportation Department inspector who claimed she was sexually harassed and forced to quit after speaking out against alleged standard work.

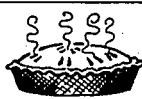
But the verdict delivered on Thursday included monetary damages of only \$1 for Cathy Cook, who claims she was denied promotions because of her gender before being harassed into quitting.

"I was shocked," Cook said. "I don't understand the money, but then I wasn't in it for the money anyway."

Cook, 42, who worked in Idaho Falls, left the department in 1993 after claiming portions of Interstate 15, Holmes Avenue and Science Center Drive were built to standard specifications.

## Fans of the Fab Four ready to get back to where they once belonged

**BURLEY** — It struck Bob Thompson that the Beatles really were back after he heard his 16-year-old nephew and his friends grooving to Doors records.

**"E**verybody thinks this new album is for the baby-boomers," said Thompson, program director and morning disc jockey at KZDX-FM, a Burley rock station. "I'm not so sure the kids won't like this album more."

This album, in case you've been in a cave since Howlin' Wolf died, is "The Beatles Anthology I," a 60-track package of previously unleased studio tapes,

live records, radio and TV sessions of the Beatles' own private recordings, due to be released Tuesday.

Through the miracle of modern sound-studio technology, it will include "Free as a Bird," recorded by John Lennon 20 years ago — and by the three surviving Beatles last year.

Lennon, of course, died in 1980. "I'm just waiting for the Jimmy Hendrix, Jim Morrison and

Janice Joplin record," Thompson quipped.

"The Beatles Anthology I" will be the first recording containing new material to be released on the Fab Four's behalf since "Let It Be" in 1970.

To say it's eagerly anticipated would be an understatement.

"I'm expecting a big response," said Richard Croft, music manager at Hastings in Twin Falls. "The old Beatles records sell well anyway, especially around Christmas time, so I think there's going to be a big demand for this."

## Ex-Glenns Ferry secretary turns into master of resume design

**GLENN'S FERRY** — When Patty Pasborg graduated from Glenns Ferry High School in 1971, all she wanted to be was a secretary.

Honest. "That was my aspiration," said Pasborg, now Pat Criscito, who has since turned her clerical skills into a cottage industry. "I didn't even want to go to college."

Since did so, eventually. Now she's one of the most popular people on the campuses she visits.

"I gave a speech at Tulane (University, in New Orleans), and the students kept me for two hours after I finished," she said. "Everybody wants to know how to design a resume."

Everybody should, says Criscito, author of "Designing the Perfect Resume," just published by Barron's. The average American in his 20s will change jobs four times by the time he's 60, according to the federal Labor Department.

"There are a lot of people who think they know how to write a resume," she said. "But the fact is that the people who read resumes spend less and less time doing so, and if your resume doesn't stand out, you're going to get passed over."

Criscito, who's 42, runs Colorado Springs-based ProType Ltd., which is an international secretarial service she established in Idaho in the early 1980s. The company designs, edits or writes more than 1,000 resumes a year. Cost: \$35 to \$65.

"You call up and talk to one of our people and give them the information you want on the resume," she said. "They'll give you suggestions, help

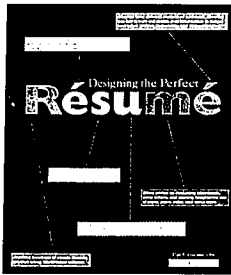

you determine what's important, and we'll design it for you."

Resumes are only part of ProType's business. The company, which Criscito runs from her Colorado home, also provides typing, proofreading, editing, design and layout services, legal and medical transcriptions, laser printing, translations, multilingual word processing, databases, business presentation and graphics. Most clients are businesses.

"Companies use us to supply services they need but don't want to do in-house," she explained. "It saves them manpower, time and money."

## Planetarium shows to open Herrett Sunday

**TWIN FALLS** — The new-look, \$3.7 million Herrett Center for the Arts and Sciences and its futuristic Faulkner Planetarium will open to the stars Sunday.

The ribbon-cutting to officially inaugurate the facility on North College Road on the north side of the College of Southern Idaho campus is scheduled for 1 p.m.

The planetarium, actually a 151-seat theater in which three-dimensional images are projected on the inside of the dome, will show its first production—"Through the Eyes of Hubble," starting at 1:30 p.m.

The 40-minute film, which takes viewers into the deep reaches of the stars via the images and information recorded by the Hubble space telescope, will be shown throughout the afternoon. The building itself will be open until 7 p.m.

The privately funded center is actually a greatly expanded version of the old Herrett Museum, which has stood on the CSI campus since 1980. It's named for Norman Herrett, a Twin Falls jeweler and high school teacher whose passion for astronomy and the archeology of pre-Columbian American gave the facility its core collection.

In addition to the planetarium and its \$500,000 Digistar projector, the center now includes five anthropology galleries, two art galleries and a classroom.

The center's regular hours will be Tuesdays from 9:30 a.m. to 9 p.m., Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Fridays from 9:30 a.m. to 9 p.m., and Saturdays from 1 to 9 p.m. The building will be closed on Sundays and Mondays.

"Through the Eyes of Hubble" will be shown on Tuesdays and Fridays at 7 p.m. and Saturdays at 2:30 and 7 p.m., although separate showings will be available for classes.

Admission to the center's museum and art galleries will be free, but admission to the planetarium shows will be \$4.

# Raven still hunting for songs to sing

**JACKPOT** - Singer/songwriter Eddy Raven has spent the morning chasing after his dogs - who often wander off to visit the neighbor dogs - on his 43-acre farm near Nashville. It's 11 a.m., and Raven has dashed into his house just in time to do a phone interview about his upcoming shows at Cactus Reges.

This is a man who's stayed true to his roots.

Born 50 years ago in Lafayette, La., Raven grew up making music and playing ball. His father was a musician and baseball player, too.

"My dad was a guitar player, and I grew up listening to bands," said Raven, who lists his major influences as Cajun, country, rock and R & B. "My dad also played ball for the Atlanta Crackers (minor league team) years ago."

Raven managed to land a few nightclub singing jobs, along with a baseball scholarship to the University of Southwestern Louisiana. In college, during a pickup game, he broke his ankle - badly.

"They had to put screws in my ankle, and, since I had been torn between baseball and music, that kind of made up my mind for me," said Raven, who was an all-state centerfielder.

In 1970, he signed a recording contract with Acuff-Rose, as a songwriter.

He went on to write songs like "Country Green" (Don Gibson), "Good Morning Country Rain" (Jennie C. Riley) and "Thank God for Kids" (Oak Ridge Boys).

Of the last song, he said simply, "I was the oldest of 10 children."

Raven eventually crossed over to the performance side of the music business and racked up some top 10 singles - like "Sometimes a Lady," "Operator, Operator" and "Who Do You Know in California?" - and some No. 1 singles like "Ti'l You Cry," "Joe Knows How to Live" and "I'm Gonna Get You."

When his first record hit the stands, he noticed that his name had been changed from Fuchs to Raven.

Actually, the name Raven happened to be a family name on the Cherokee side of Eddy's family, though he didn't know it at the time ("my grandmother was happy"). And the name Fuchs is German slang for fox.

Either way, the singer had the nature/wildlife front well covered.

He's an outdoors person, too. Raven has filmed several fishing and hunting shows on TV during the last 10 years. They're not bad, he said, but it's not like really going out and doing it.

He explained, "They say, 'Can you do that again, we didn't quite get it when you tackled the bear.'"

The one time Raven said no to a TV stunt was when he was asked to sit up in a tree with a bow and arrow and shoot a 400-pound Russian boar. "The boar was in a cage and couldn't do anything about it," Raven said, "and besides, it would have been my luck to fall down and end up with me and the boar in the pen."

On the home front, Raven is married and has two boys, just out of school and interested in the music business. Right now, one of them is working for Gibson Guitar and the other is working at a Blockbuster. Raven's wife handles the business end of the Raven operations, which includes a booking agency and a publishing company in the works.

Raven's newest album, released last year, is titled "Wild Eyed and Crazy." His next album, due out in January, will be a combination of old hits and new tunes.

Raven frequently appears on the TNN show "Yesteryear."

He wants to do more songwriting, he said, but time flies - when you're having fun. Even when ideas come to Raven on the road, there are hours of extra work involved in finishing up a song in the studio back home. "You learn your craft," Raven said, "but this is mostly 1 percent inspiration and 99 percent perspiration."

**"American President" (PG-13)** — Like a seasoned politician, this movie puts on a good-natured public face, managing to be charming in an innocuous sort of way. Director Rob Reiner works mightily to give us a warm, fuzzy picture about a widowed president of the United States who, despite all his power, faces that most common of human emotions — loneliness. (Mall Cinema)

## Capsule reviews

**"GoldenEye" (PG-13)** — The 19th of the series gets its name from an Ian Fleming story or novel but for the author's getaway home in the Caribbean. In the film, it's the name of a secret Russian mechanism that can unleash the destruction of a metropolis or two. The new James Bond is Brosnan, Pierce Brosnan. back as the cockatoo coifed pet detective. Although Carrey does some reasonably funny impressions of Charlton Heston and other humans, this tepid and unimaginative sequel is unnecessarily loud, frantic, and only a fraction as funny as the original. **"Coyote" (R)** — An efficient suspenser about a serial killer who mimics famous murderers of the

**"Fast Game" (R)** — A dopey, slam-bang chase movie from "Lethal Weapon" producer Joel Silver, designed as a star vehicle for uber-mannuquin Cindy Crawford, whose hair is in a state of perpetually artful mussiness and whose lines are delightfully delivered her lines in a voice as flat as an unvilled cartoon character. **"Get Shorty" (R)** — Hilarious and inspired adaptation of Elmore Leonard's novel about a wiseguy loan shark who'd rather be producing "Goodfellas." age piece set in Indiana in 1970 in which girls take over in a male-dominated genre. The wonderful Christina Ricci and three other fine young actresses do their best in a losing cause. (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema)

**"Powder" (PG-13)** — A hairless, porcelain-white teen-ager displays telekinetic powers and an IQ of Einsteinian proportions in this handsome fantasy film, but alas the script operates nowhere near such lofty levels, succumbing to lame dialogue and sidetracking down uncomfortable cul-de-sacs of scarred father-son relationships and young gay lust. 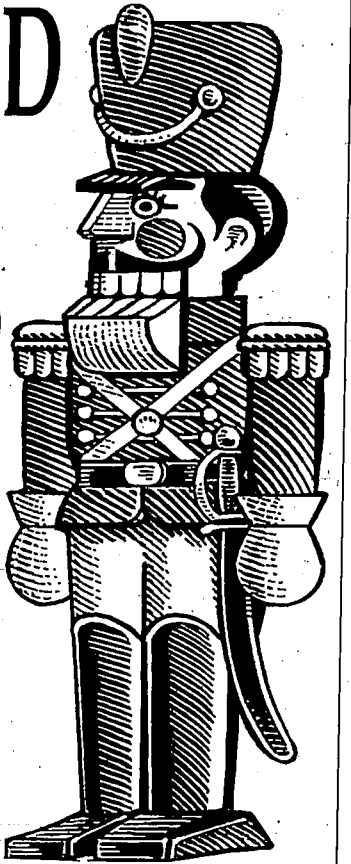

# For Eco, single layer of prose would never do

NEW YORK — "There are novels that are like pizzas, and mine are like club sandwiches," said Umberto Eco, when asked why he writes "multilayered" novels that seemingly require reference books to understand.

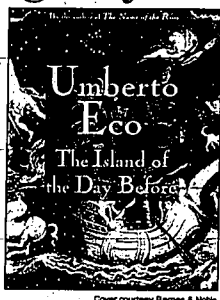
Eco, author of "The Name of the Rose" and "Foucault's Pendulum," was in New York on a tour to publicize the U.S. publication of his third novel, "The Island of the Day Before" (Harcourt Brace, \$25). He had just given a reading at the 92nd Street YMCA in New York and was taking questions from the audience.

Two days later, sitting at a table at the Algonquin Hotel, Eco remembers the response. "It came to mind at the moment," he says. "Multilayered means really also that you can decide to eat only one part."

Eco looks professional in his jacket and tie and dark-rimmed glasses, his salt-and-pepper beard the length of longish stubble. He reclines comfortably, smokes Merits, thinks out his answers, which are spoken with the expressive vowels and subtle humor of Italy's Piedmont region.

Eco once wrote that he began thinking about writing "The Name of the Rose," his medieval murder mystery, with one idea that he would like to noisily a monk. "Foucault's Pendulum" began with two images: a vast pendulum in a Paris museum and a scene from his own childhood at the end of World War II: a boy playing the trumpet in a cemetery.

"What I really discovered from the first books is that I don't start with an idea, or a program but from an image," says Eco, who is also known as a scholar in the field of semiotics, the study of signs and symbols. (He

is within view of an island across the strait, but he cannot swim. He is at the 180th meridian of longitude, the International Date Line, and the island is thus truly in the day before.

"When you have a good image," Eco says, "then you go and the novel grows by itself. It takes time, in this case six years."

The first two years were involved with setting up a world, which he says he always does with his novels. (He often quotes Woody Allen in a movie in which the Allen character was accused of playing God: "Everybody has to choose his role models.") It is a world "of which I must know everything."

"If there is a staircase, I must know how many steps there are in that staircase," he says. "Then they don't show up in the novel, but I must know that." (For "The Name of the Rose" he built an imaginary abbey; a conversation of two monks walking from the refectory to the cloister, he says, lasted just the right amount of time.)

It was very difficult to build up the ship, because in this age there were not very precise drawings of ships," he says. He visited naval museums and examined Renaissance maritime paintings.

"Then I found a book in London which was describing, really inch for inch, a British ship more or less of the same size, more or less of the same period ... that helped me a lot to know how to construct my own."

His own is an elaborate, labyrinthine construction — it has a room full of clocks, a room full of birds — on which, little by little, the narrator della Griva detects

teaches semiotics at the University of Bologna, and has published numerous texts and essays in scholarly journals.)

"In the case of 'The Island of the Day Before' the first impulse was, OK, I have written two books about books, libraries, monasteries, museums — would I be able to deal with bare nature? Nature, only nature, without books. And then I had the idea of a ship, of a castaway on a ship, the island in front, and then I started."

"The Island of the Day Before" is set in 1643 on a ship anchored off one of the islands of Fiji. A minor Italian nobleman, Roberto della Griva, has landed there after his own vessel had been shipwrecked. "I am, I believe, alone of all our race, the only man in human memory to have been shipwrecked and cast up upon a deserted ship," della Griva writes. He

signs of an intruder.

Eco found a real Pacific island, too — not quite on the International Date Line but a few miles away. "I spent two weeks (videotape-recording what I saw: clouds and colors and fish; otherwise I could not have spoken of corals, because corals play a role in the novel; I must confess it was the first time I went to the South Seas and it was the first time I saw those corals, which are incredible — the variety of shades and colors of corals in the other hemisphere are incredible."

A species of bird he learned about on his trip became a central motif in the novel. He stalked this orange dove at dawn. "They hide at the top of the island trees and usually they don't show up so you have to go around making click-click, click-click," Eco clucked. "After a while they answer, with click-click, whoosh! And you see them, like a flash, the orange dove flying up. That's all."

# Eagles grab win

## CSI, Pasadena move ahead in K&T Steel

TWIN FALLS — Host College of Southern Idaho and Pasadena Junior College of California opened the 1995 K&T Steel tournament with victories Thursday night.

Pasadena, after a long day of waiting for fog to dissipate so the plane could leave Ontario, Calif., and get into foggy Boise, controlled the final 30 minutes of play to beat Eastern Arizona 81-73.

CSI, getting an excellent all-around game on the perimeter, downed Ellsworth, Iowa, 87-72 in the nightcap.

Ellsworth and Eastern Arizona square off at 6 p.m. today to start the second round with CSI and Pasadena meeting at 8 p.m. Saturday's windup will pit Ellsworth and Pasadena at 6 p.m., and CSI and Eastern Arizona in the finale.

CSI jumped out 16-0 on Ellsworth but, as Coach Steve Irons said, "I knew it wasn't going to be like that all night."

Ellsworth spent the rest of the night dropping CSI 20-point leads to 10 and watching the Eagles push it back up to 20 again.

The game came in opposites from the expected. Ellsworth, headed by guards Tremaine Cooper and Richard Williams with Gary Finley as a kicker, was expected to dominate the perimeter with CSI holding sway inside.

It didn't work like that.

Yoder neutralized Cooper, who came in with a 27-point average, by holding him to 17 and getting 18 himself. George Brown tanked 15 while giving up 17 to Williams.

But Ellsworth out-rebounded the taller Eagles, particularly in the late second half, and "they beat us to the ball a number of times," Irons pointed out.

"I knew at the shoot-around and the pre-game that we were ready to play," Irons said. "You could see it when the game started. But then we got up, felt we were in command and didn't maintain our intensity. They came out and did some one-on-one things in the second half and it took us a while to get it rolling again."

After the early 16-0 deficit, Ellsworth got back within 11 at 31-20 but trailed by 18 at intermission. Ellsworth managed just 6-14 free throws in that span.

Marcus Wallace, who had 26 points, gave CSI a 46-26 lead as the second half began but then Cooper and Williams hit off some individual moves and Johnson Isidore added a field goal.

Somehow, Eastern chipped back over the next several minutes and two three-

# BSU player returns to home turf

BOISE — When he steps onto the Kibbie Dome field in Moscow Saturday, Bernie Zimmerman expects to discover that you really can't go home again.

Zimmerman, a 6-foot, 4-inch, 244-pound Boise State senior tight end, played football at Moscow High School and transferred to BSU from the University of Idaho last year.

Zimmerman is third this year on the BSU receiving list with 22 catches for 370 yards and four touchdowns.

On Saturday, he will play his first and most highly prized game in the Kibbie Dome as a Bronco.

In the traditional rivalry BSU (7-3, 4-2 Big Sky Conference) will try to knock down an NCAA Division I-AA playoff berth against the Vandals (5-4, 3-3). It will be the final Big Sky Conference game for the two teams.

Both BSU and Idaho will move to the Big West Conference and NCAA Division I-A football next year. ("Boise" is home now," said Zimmerman, reflecting on last year's 27-74 BSU win which snapped the Vandals' 11-year series winning streak.

"It wasn't as weird having them play down here. But I think it's going to be kind of weird going in that stadium."

Zimmerman has been a success since walking on at BSU. He made 10 receptions for 73 yards in the Broncos' four playoff games last season. "I played in Moscow in high school and I was supposed to play there in college, but it didn't turn out that way. It will be a little different to walk in there."

The soft-spoken Zimmerman said he has talked with his mother, Alice Zimmerman of Moscow, this week about the game. "It's just another game," he said. "I'm not into the rivalry thing. Sure, it's the Vandals, or whatever, but if I could up in that, I won't play as good as I could."

BSU coach Pokey Allen says the Broncos are primed with their five-game winning streak and will be pushed by the need to win to secure a playoff berth.

"We'll play well," Allen said. "I don't know what's going to happen during the game, but we've been playing awfully well

# Filer pulls past Glenns Ferry, 47-37

# Heisman focus shines on Husker, Buckeye players

In one of the most competitive Heisman races in years, Nebraska quarterback Tommie Frazier and Ohio State running back Eddie George — the best players on the two best teams — have emerged as the favorites.

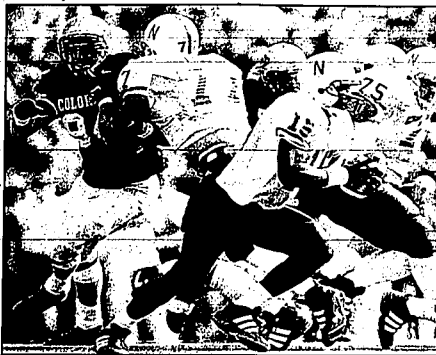
But there's still three weeks before the ballots are counted, giving Florida quarterback Danny Wuerffel and Iowa State running back Troy Davis — who have the best passing and rushing numbers — time to boost their campaigns.

"I think Danny deserves it as much as anybody," Florida coach Steve Spurrier, who won the award himself in 1966, said this week. Most of the focus, however, appears to be turning toward Frazier and George, especially after their performances last weekend.

George, a senior for No. 2 Ohio State, gained a school-record 314 yards in a 41-3 victory over Illinois, which entered the game with the 10th-ranked defense in the country.

"I've been coaching for 32 years and I have not seen a back like that," Illinois defensive coordinator Denny Marcin said.

Frazier, hoping to guide top-ranked Nebraska to his second straight national championship, led a 41-3 rout of then-No. 10 Kansas despite playing with a bruised heel and strained arch. He rushed for a season-high 99 yards and two TDs

and threw for another score.

It was a typical performance for Frazier, who has completed 58 percent of his passes for 1,234 yards and 15 TDs and rushed for 569 yards (6.5 per carry) and 14 scores.

"He's got to be No. 1 in the minds of a lot of Heisman Trophy voters," Nebraska center Aaron

Graham said. "The thing I like so much about him is the fact he's got this competitive fire that pumps you up every time you look at him."

Neither player is campaigning for the award, which will be presented Dec. 9 at the Downtown Athletic Club in New York. "I'm not really concerned about the Heisman,"

George said. "I'm more concerned about the Rose Bowl and how to finish the year."

George has rushed for 1,592 yards with two games remaining in Ohio State's regular season, giving him an outside shot to gain 2,000 yards before the Heisman votes are counted. No back in Division I his-

tory has reached that magic figure and failed to win the award.

Davis could be the first. With 1,830 yards heading into Saturday's season finale at Missouri, the sophomore can make it to 2,000 with an average performance. Unfortunately for him, Paul Hornung is the only Heisman winner to play

for a losing team, and Iowa State (3-7) gets virtually no national exposure.

Still, Iowa State coach Dan McCarney is willing to compare his star runner to anyone in games against Kansas, Colorado, Kansas State and Nebraska — all of whom were in the Top 10 when they played the Cyclones — Davis gained 627 yards on 131 carries.

"He's the toughest back I've ever seen in college football," McCarney said. "I've never seen one as tough as he is, taking the hits and taking all the tackles and all the pileups and three, four, five, six of them hitting him at once."

Wuerffel isn't hampered by his team's record — the No. 3 Gators are 9-0 for the first time in school history — but he does have to overcome stiff regional competition and the perception that anyone could pile up big numbers in Spurrier's "Fun-N-Gun" offense.

Wuerffel's Heisman hopes may have suffered a fatal blow two weeks ago when he sat out a game against Northern Illinois — and backup quarterback Eric Kresser threw for a school-record 458 yards.

"A lot of quarterbacks have proven they can't play in this system," Spurrier objected. "Somebody Danny doesn't get as much credit because he doesn't throw as hard as some other quarterbacks. But notice that he about always gets it there."

## Nashville inks deal for Oilers; NFL vote not in

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Nashville has long sought a major pro sports franchise, and on Thursday it landed the Houston Oilers.

In the latest NFL craze of franchise free agency, Nashville signed a deal that could make the Music City home to the Oilers by 1998. The team would likely play the next two seasons in Memphis.

Nashville, recently spurned by the NFL champion New Jersey Devils, would become the fourth city added to the NFL roster this year and the second in 11 days, following the Cleveland Browns' intended move to Baltimore.

Nashville officials signed a 50-page document that lays out the \$292 million deal that could have the Oilers playing in Tennessee by next fall. The city is required to help find an interim stadium if the Oilers buy out the two years remaining on their Astrodome lease.

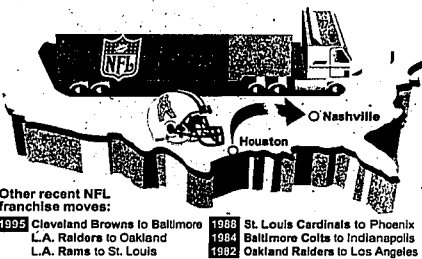
"As a lame-duck term, I would hope we could work something out," Oilers owner Bud Adams said at a signing ceremony Thursday. Hurdles remain, however, including the approval of NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue, who owes the league a report after he reviews the Oilers' move and Nashville's bid.

Nashville Mayor Phil Bredesen hopes league approval will come during the owners' March 15 meeting. The mayor wants to begin construction on the stadium by next April and have it ready for the Oilers by the fall of 1998.

Browns' announcement on Nov. 6 of a move to Baltimore. Before the season started, the Rams moved from Los Angeles to St. Louis and the Raiders from Los Angeles to Oakland.

## Grizzlies meet faltering Bobcats; Broncos vie for spot in playoffs

The Big Sky Conference's automatic playoff berth already is in Montana coach Don Read's pocket, but he expects little trouble in getting his Grizzlies up for their regular season finale.

Montana (8-2 overall, 5-1 in league play) travels to Bozeman Saturday afternoon to take on Montana State (5-5, 2-4), marking the 95th game of the Grizzlies-Bobcats rivalry.

"I don't have any doubts that both teams will be focused. We have a lot of respect for the Bobcats, their coaching staff and for their personnel," Read says. "We know that they'll play their best football game against us."

MSU coach Cliff Hysell hopes so. Last week, his squad lost 35-7 to Boise State. Last year in Missoula, the Bobcats came out on the short end of a 55-20 score.

A three-game skid has left MSU out of the playoff picture, and the Bobcats will take the field at Reno H. Sales Stadium without injured quarterback Jeff Tuss. Redshirt freshman Rob Compton will start in his place.

Still, there's always pride, and Hysell is typical to get the most of his team. But he knows the odds are long — especially with Dave Dickenson calling signals for the Grizzlies.



Montana is a very good football team, and they are very deserving Big Sky champions. Dickenson is Division I-A's and the Big Sky's top quarterback, leading the nation in total offense with 381.3 yards per game. He has hit 227-of-422 passes for 3,792 yards and 34 touchdowns this year.

Montana holds a commanding lead in the series, with Bozeman would rewrite that ledger at 53-33.

Victory also would give the Grizzlies sole possession of the Big Sky title. They won the automatic playoff spot by beating BSU and Weber State, currently sharing second place.

"We're very proud of our kids," Read says. "What winning reflects is a lot of hard work, it's easy to lose. But to win, you have to get after it."

In a regular season and Big Sky finale for both teams, BSU (7-3, 4-2) needs to beat Idaho (5-3, 3-3) to join Montana in the playoffs. A playoff spot also may be at stake for Weber (6-4, 4-2), which travels to Idaho State (5-5, 2-4).

Eastern Washington (3-7, 1-6) is on the road against non-conference foe Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (4-6).

Weber and ISU enter their game in Pocatello heading opposite directions. The Wildcats have won three in a row; the Bengals have lost five straight.

"We need to win to keep our playoff hopes alive and finish second in the league. They are looking to ... produce a winning season of their own," Weber coach Dave Arslanian says.

The Wildcats have done well under reserve quarterback Roger Cook, who took over for the injured Bryan Martin on Oct. 21. Cook has thrown for 744 yards and four touchdowns since then.

ISU counters with the Big Sky's top rusher, Alfredo Anderson, averaging 108.4 yards per game. He's run for 11 TDs this season.

For Bengals coach Brian McNeely, the matchup is a shot for ISU to halt its 10-game losing streak to the Wildcats.

"We are playing our best football of the season," he says. "This is an excellent opportunity for us. If we win, we would have back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in 14 years."

EWU's trip to Cal Poly-SLO offers the Eagles an American West Conference foe they beat last year 63-7.

## Bruins look to break through Trojans' recent success in cross-town rivalry

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A win by USC Saturday's traditional game against UCLA would end a four-year losing streak against their rivals for the Trojans. A victory by the Bruins would mean considerably more to them.

Eleventh-ranked USC (8-1-1, 6-0-1) already has clinched the Pacific-10 title and Rose Bowl berth.

UCLA, on the other hand, can keep its hopes for a bowl bid alive, salvage what has been a mediocre season, and give Terry Donahue a Pac-10 coaching record with a win. "I think it'll be huge, absolutely. Gigantic is probably a better word," Donahue said of the game that will draw a sellout crowd of 92,000 to the Coliseum.

"We're going to have a lot at stake. We've got a chance to have a lot of great goals met in this game."

Donahue, the Bruins' head coach for 20 years, fully appreciates the significance of having "bragging rights" in Los Angeles for the next

year. "This is my 25th consecutive game and I've had in two or three of your season hinges on this one game," he said. "I've been 10-1 before and treated like a dog (for losing to USC)."

UCLA offensive tackle Jonathan Ogden understands the stakes. "This game is always going to the Rose Bowl," he said. "It would be nice to put them in with a loss. We're trying to spoil their season right now; that's a powerful motivation for us."

Although he downplays it, Donahue can't claim a record for most Pac-10 coaching wins. He goes into the game tied with former Washington coach Don James at 97.

The Bruins (6-4, 3-4 Pac-10) will try to extend their winning streak against USC to five games. "This would be the longest run of dominance by either team in the 65-year-old rivalry between the schools, located some 15 freeway miles apart."

"I think our team has matched up physically the last couple of years

better than we have in the past," Donahue said of the Bruins' win streak.

John Robinson, in the third year back of his second turn as Trojans' coach, agreed, saying: "I thought there was a wide disparity in the talent, particularly two years ago. I thought that was really good UCLA team and they went to the Rose Bowl."

"I still think their offensive line is really outstanding, but I think we've come up in that area, being physical."

The Bruins won 24-21 in 1991, then 38-37 the following year, 27-21 in 1993 and 31-19 a year ago.

The Trojans' only loss this season came at Notre Dame, a 38-10 defeat, and particularly two years ago, 21-21. The Bruins, meanwhile, will try to shake off the effects of a two-game slump, losing 37-33 to Arizona State and 38-14 to Washington.

UCLA has committed nine turnovers in the last six quarters.

Mike Price, Washington State's head coach, thought this year's Cougars could have a winning season and go to a bowl game. His expectations looked realistic when the Cougars got off to a 3-2 start and lost only 35-21 at Nebraska, now the No. 1 team in the nation.

But since beating Oregon State 40-14, the Cougars have lost to Southern California, Oregon, Arizona, California and Stanford, and are now going in the right direction, Price said. "We've been in kind of a slide."

If the Cougars can beat the Huskies, it will make their season, Price said.

## Vaughn edges Belle for AL's top honors

NEW YORK (AP) — Mo Vaughn posted big numbers early, carrying the Boston Red Sox when there was no one else. Albert Belle poured it on later, after the Cleveland Indians were running away.

So is that why Vaughn won the AL MVP award, or was it because of another factor, one far from the field?

Vaughn beat out Belle for the trophy Thursday in one of the closest elections ever, a vote that called into question whether the Cleveland star's surliness cost him the honor.

Belle, considered one of baseball's nice guys, and Belle, regarded by many as Mr. Nasty, tied for the league lead with 126 RBIs. Belle, however, led the majors with 50 home runs in the shortened season and became the first player to get 100 extra-base hits since Stan Musial in 1948.

But Belle has earned a reputation for being uncooperative and downright rude to reporters — who do the voting. He is expected to be penalized by major league baseball this month for berating a television reporter during the World Series, although that outburst came after all 28 ballots were returned.

"I guess I really does say something," Vaughn said at a news conference in Boston, held at a center where founded a youth development program. "People are looking at the whole thing and that it's just not numbers."

A letter that accompanies the official ballot to members of the Baseball Writers Association of America lists the five rules of which have remained unchanged since the original ballot in 1931 — to consider. The third guideline: "General character, disposition, loyalty and effort."

Vaughn, regarded by media members and fans as a pleasant person, hit 300 with 39 home runs as the first baseman for the AL East champion Boston Red Sox. Belle batted .317 as an All-Star outfielder for the Indians, whose 100 wins were the most in the majors.

# King jury at impasse; mistrial declared

NEW YORK (AP) — Boxing promoter Don King found himself waiting for a decision Thursday. U.S. District Judge Lawrence McKenna declared a mistrial Thursday afternoon in the insurance fraud case against King when jurors said they were hopelessly deadlocked after four days of deliberation.

King, who rose from the gambling halls of Cleveland to become one of the most powerful men in boxing, smiled broadly when the mistrial was declared. But prosecutors immediately appealed the decision, and won a hearing Friday before the 2nd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

After the appellate court agreed to hear the case, McKenna ordered the jurors back to court Friday for possible further deliberations. Both sides will argue their case before the appeals court Friday.

King, who was acquitted of tax evasion in 1985 and has been the target of three grand jury investigations, is charged with faking an insurance contract to collect \$350,000 in bogus training fees for a canceled 1991 fight.

He faces a maximum 45 years in prison and \$2.25 million fine if convicted on nine counts of mail fraud.

The flamboyant promoter, whose six-week trial drew heavyweight boxer Mike Tyson, has handled virtually every big-name fighter of the past 20 years.

King promoted Muhammad Ali's historic "Rumble in the Jungle" with George Foreman in 1974, and his "Thrilla in Manila" against Joe Frazier in 1975.

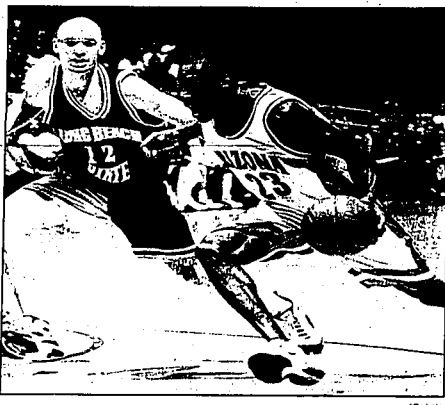
Tyson, Sugar Ray Leonard, Larry Holmes and Roberto Duran are among the other boxers promoted by King, a numbers boss who started a second life while behind bars for beating a man to death.

King wrote Ali from jail and established a relationship that launched his career as a promoter of nearly 300 championship fights.

During the trial, King testified that he never instructed employees to alter the contract with Lloyd's of London.

Defense lawyer Peter Fleming blamed the acquittal on Maffia, the government's star witness. Fleming suggested that Maffia tried to cover up his own illegal actions by blaming King.

# Utah State favored among West teams

Just when Big West teams were getting the hang of beating UNLV, the Runnin' Rebels are getting out of the conference.

After dominating the Big West for a decade under Jerry Tarkanian, UNLV may be a mere also-ran in the school's last season of play in the league before moving on to the Western Athletic Conference.

A lot will have to go right under new coach Bill Bayno for the Runnin' Rebels to be a factor in a league where Tarkanian's teams of the '80s went an amazing 165-12 over 10 years.

Since then, though, the Rebels have been a mere 30-24 against Big West opponents, who have gotten a measure of revenge against a succession of coaches.

"But they've just had a lot of coaching changes the last few years that have kind of disrupted the talent they've had," New Mexico State coach Neil McCarthy said.

"But they have talent and they've got a good young coach now who will stand behind them and get that program built back up."

Even in its last year in the Big West, UNLV still holds the marquee name in a conference that has generally been overlooked when it comes time for the NCAA tournament.

Utah State, this year's favorite, will likely have to win the automatic tournament berth that comes with the league championship to have any shot of making the postseason tournament. "We've still got a good league without them, but you'd like to have a team like that in your conference," McCarthy said. "I don't like to see them leave the conference."

Bayno takes over a UNLV team coming off the worst season in the school's basketball history. First under Tim Grigurch, then under a succession of assistants, the Runnin' Rebels struggled to a 12-16 mark last season and won only seven of 18 league games.

Still, a good recruiting effort by Bayno, the top assistant at Massachusetts the past seven years, has Rebels fans looking for big things once again. "People have such high expectations," Bayno said. "It's unfair for people to think we'll get 20

to 25 wins this year. Eighty percent of the games we step on the court this year we won't have the talent other teams have. But our goal is to be the hardest playing team in the country."

While Bayno tries to rebuild a once-flamboyant program shattered by three years of coaching turmoil, coach Larry Eustachy already has a strong foundation in the quiet town of Logan, Utah.

Utah State went 21-8 and won its first Big West regular-season title in 15 years. The Aggies return conference player of the year Eric Franson, who led the league in scoring at 18.4 points and was second in rebounding at 9.8. "We were on top of the league standings for about 90 percent of the season so we had teams firing at us all year long, and it took its toll," Eustachy said. "The last thing we want to do is completely crash after winning the conference title last season."

New Mexico State, meanwhile, must contend with some of the problems that plagued UNLV's program

under Tarkanian if it is to be a strong conference contender once again.

New Mexico State is already ineligible for postseason play under its own sanctions after two former assistant coaches provided test answers and papers for players to gain fraudulent eligibility through correspondence courses at two schools.

The Aggies will play the season waiting to see if the NCAA metes out further punishment when it rules in February.

McCarthy has no returning starters and no letterman back from last year's 25-10 team.

While things are unsettled in the Big West, the neighboring Pac-10 is loaded with defending national champion UCLA and four other teams that made last year's NCAA tournament.

The Bruins ranked fourth in the preseason Top 25, carried a 19-game winning streak into this season. Charles O'Bannon will be the key to the team, along with point guard Cameron Dollar, guard Toby Bailey and forward J.R. Henderson, all of whom gained valuable experience in the tournament run.

"Until something changes, they are the team that needs to be reckoned with always because they are coming off a national championship and that's pretty big stuff," Stanford coach Mike Montgomery said.

O'Bannon takes over for his brother, Ed, as the court leader of UCLA, which also lost Tyus Edney and George Zidek to graduation.

Arizona, a perennial Top 10 team, lost last year's co-PC-10 player of the year Damon Stoudamire and forward Ray Owes from a team that went 23-8 but was bounced in the first round of the NCAA tournament by Michigan.

The Wildcats finished second in the conference last year, but could be hand-pressed this year to give Lute Olson the 19 wins he needs to reach 500 for his career.

Instead, Stanford, ranked 18th in the preseason poll, is favored to finish second to UCLA after being fifth last season with a 10-8 record. The Cardinal return five starters from a team that went 20-9 and made the second round of the NCAA tournament.

Tarkanian beat UNLV to the WAC one season, and he has everyone around his alma mater excited. The Bulldogs have three starters back from a 15-15 season but Tarkanian brought in two solid junior college guards and recruited highly touted forward Terrance Roberson.

Tarkanian's presence will take some of the spotlight from Utah, the favorite to win the league with outstanding forward Keith Van Horn, the conference player of the year.

Santa Clara is the heavy favorite to win the West Coast Conference and senior guard Steve Nash is one of the country's most underrated players.

The Big Sky won its first NCAA tournament game since 1982 last season when Weber State knocked off Michigan State. The Wildcats lost four starters, so the league looks to be a Montana-Montana State dogfight.

The American West still only has four teams — two below NCAA minimum for automatic bid consideration — and one of them is Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, which is pretty much a lock to improve on last season's 1-26 mark.

# Tark takes on tough task at Fresno State

FRESNO, Calif. (AP) — With 6:03 left and his team trailing by 25 points, Jerry Tarkanian glanced at his watch and shook his head.

Perhaps he was wondering just how long it will take the coach with the best winning percentage in NCAA history to turn around a team that has had just two winning seasons in the past decade.

The Tarkanian era at Fresno State began Wednesday night with a 102-86 loss to Weber State in the first round of the Preseason NIT. After three years away from college basketball, his first game back was a shock.

"We played worse than my worst dreams," Tarkanian said. "We got totally destroyed by a

team that played much better than we did. They just came in here and picked us to pieces in every aspect of the game."

Everything seemed to start well for Fresno State. Rahaan Smith took an alley-oop pass from James Gray for a dunk 18 seconds into the game, and then blocked a shot as the Bulldogs' swarming defense was met with raucous applause from fans waving Tarkanian towels.

Tarkanian sat calmly on the bench, fulfilling his promise to be less intense during games than during his glory days at UNLV. Even when he stood up, his hands stayed in his pockets all the time.

But that 2-0 start was to be Fresno State's biggest lead of the game. And Tarkanian's relation did not last long.

Damrell McCulloch picked up a couple of quick fouls and Gray got the first of his three early fouls, and Tarkanian reached for his trademark white towel.

He nervously began chewing it, and rarely stopped for the rest of the evening.

"I told myself coming to the gym I was not going to let it tear me apart," Tarkanian said. "I think I was more relaxed than usual. I really didn't feel good, you can't sit there and feel good when you play like we did."

# A's hire Howe to manage, opt for younger players

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — An Howe is presiding over another youth movement. This time, he hopes to stick around to reap the benefits.

The Oakland Athletics, whose new owners intend to cut payroll by emphasizing young talent over more expensive veteran players, hired Howe on Thursday.

He signed a two-year contract with a club option for a third season.

"It might take a little while to get us going but I'm going to dedicate myself to bringing a championship back to Oakland," Howe said. "Hopefully, it won't take as long as some of us think. But we're certainly going to develop a very competitive team, a young team and it's

going to get better and better, and hopefully we're all going to be here when we're on top."

Howe, 48, succeeds Tony La Russa, who left the A's to manage the St. Louis Cardinals.

General manager Sandy Alderson said Howe is known for his patient teaching style, which was seen as a critical attribute given the A's direction.

"Not only does he have managerial experience but he has experience within the context that our team will develop next year," Alderson said. "He has worked with young players. He has taken a young group and developed them over a period of time into a championship-caliber, very competitive organization."

# Are chip stocks ready for a tumble?

**'Investors should move to the sidelines ...'**

— Rick Whittington, financial advisor, on semiconductor stocks. Whittington's assessment caused Micron stock to plummet earlier this week

Is the semiconductor industry still in the early innings of an unprecedented boom or peaking after years of expansion? This is the dominant debate among chip investors today, and right now the bears are crushing the bulls. The Philadelphia Stock Exchange's Semiconductor Index has plummeted 23 percent since its peak Sept. 11, and well over half the decline has occurred this month. Even industry Kingpin Intel is getting clobbered; it closed at \$65.13 Tuesday, down \$2 for the day and \$7.75 since Nov. 2. Most likely, the bulls have it right — demand will outpace supply in years to come,

despite a bevy of semiconductor plants under construction worldwide, and top-tier chip stocks will easily set new highs in 1996. One of many good omens was last month's semiconductor industry book-to-bill ratio — a comparison of orders to shipments — which rose to 1.18 in October from 1.15 in September. But the bears still need lots of convincing.

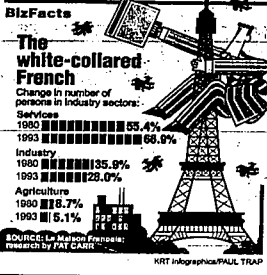
So while smart chip investors won't sell at today's prices, they'll also refrain from adding to their holdings until signs of strength reappear. The heart of the problem is that investors are skeptical that the semiconductor industry is evolving from a cyclical industry into a growth industry. In the past, semiconductor makers typically enjoyed four boom years,

followed by a bust as new factories came on stream, pumped out too many chips and depressed prices. Today's chip industry, however, already five years old, can't last much longer, the skeptics figure.

Some formerly upbeat analysts, such as Soundview Financial's Rick Whittington, have doubts fretting all the more.

"Supply is coming into the market sooner than anybody expected a year ago, and that signals wholesale increases in semiconductor supply that will eventually create pricing pressure," he says. "Investors should move to the sidelines before this becomes terribly apparent."

### 30-year fixed mortgage rates decrease slightly

WASHINGTON — Thirty-year, fixed rate mortgages averaged 7.35 percent this week, down from 7.37 percent last week, according to a national survey released Thursday by the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp.

It was the lowest since Feb. 24, 1994, when rates averaged 7.32 percent. Rates have fallen steadily since a high of 9.25 percent the week of Nov. 23, 1994.

On one-year adjustable rate mortgages, lenders were asking an average initial rate of 5.65 percent, up from 5.64 percent last week. Fifteen-year mortgages, a popular option for those refinancing mortgages, averaged 6.86 percent this week, down from 6.87 percent a week earlier.

### Idaho firm will open wood products plant in Ontario

BOISE, Idaho — Boise Cascade Corp. has formed a joint venture with Stone-Consolidated Corp. and other investors to open a new panel plant at Barwick, Ontario, Canada.

Boise Cascade said the plant, which is expected to be open by the middle of 1997, will have a capacity of 400 million square feet annually of 4-by-8 foot oriented strand board panels. At full production, the plant will have 120 workers.

## Chance for lower interest rates gives stocks another shot

**NEW YORK** — Stocks plowed further into record territory Thursday, as investors looked beyond the budget fight in Washington and focused instead on the possibility of lower interest rates.

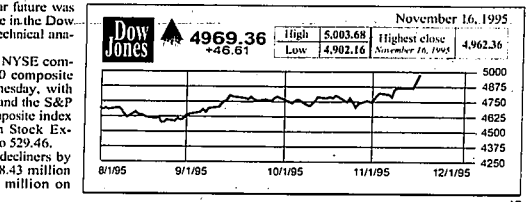
Traders said stocks were also supported by Friday's double expiration of options and futures contracts in a quarterly event that often adds to trading volatility.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 46.61 to 4969.36. While it ended more than 30 points beneath the 5,000 mark, the blue-chip index did record the sixth record high in the last seven trading sessions.

Traders said a 5,000 Dow in the near future was possible. "It's literally a fractional move in the Dow stocks to the 5,000," Greg Nie, a technical analyst at Everen Securities in Chicago.

Broad market indexes also rose. The NYSE composite and the Standard & Poor's 500 composite both topped record highs set on Wednesday, with the NYSE index rising 2.01 to 3,184.8 and the S&P adding 3.38 to 597.34. The Nasdaq composite index rose 6.1 to 1,044.48. The American Stock Exchange's market value index rose 2.24 to \$29.46.

On the NYSE, advancing issues led decliners by about 7 to 4. Volume was heavy at 418.43 million shares as of 4 p.m., up from 373.06 million on Wednesday.



## Foreign funds test patience of their partisans

**NEW YORK** — Nearing the end of a second straight disappointing year in foreign markets, investors in international stock mutual funds may be starting to wonder whether they took the wrong route.

As funds investing overseas suffered a series of losses in 1994 and early 1995, large numbers of their shareholders kept the faith, reasoning that the bright promise in foreign economies was worth the price of a little short-term volatility.

Since then, however, their confidence has been tested further. While the U.S. market has rallied sharply to new highs, other markets around the world have staged a less rewarding rebound.

During the first three quarters of 1995, an average of 276 international funds tracked by the research firm of Lipper Analytical Services Inc. posted a 7.44 percent return, including reinvestment of dividends. That pales before the 27.20 percent re-

turn recorded by Lipper's average of 1,934 funds investing primarily in U.S. stocks.

For the five years through Sept. 30, international funds had a cumulative return of 67.76 percent, only a little more than half the domestic funds' average of 128.84 percent.

"This is the second consecutive year that our international fund allocation has been a drag on the performance of our portfolio," says Walter Frank, chief investment officer at the advisory service IBC's Moneyletter in Ashland, Mass.

"After a two-year run with such results, it is only natural to ask whether we have totally misread the outlook for the international equity markets."

One reason why Wall Street has fared better than most foreign financial centers this year, Frank says, is that profit growth in the United States has been stronger than expected, making progress by foreign companies look less compelling by comparison.

Also, he says, an unexpectedly large drop in U.S. interest rates has made American stocks look like better values than they might otherwise have appeared.

At the same time, many analysts have noted an apparent shift in the way investors with a global viewpoint have approached the markets.

Rather than venture directly into foreign stocks, a significant number of investors have decided this year to seek to participate in global growth by owning shares of U.S. multinational companies.

These big-name blue chips have a much more stable image than investments in overseas markets. But the exposure that can be gained through them to world economies is very real, two academic researchers point out.

The companies that make up Standard & Poor's 500-stock composite index, one of the best known yardsticks of the U.S. market, in the aggregate own nearly one-third of their sales volume outside the United States, say Lewis Mandel of Marquette University and Mary M. Cudler of Central Connecticut State University.

In addition, they point out, index funds modeled after the S&P 500 are significantly

cheaper to run than funds that invest overseas with all their research and operating costs.

"Recognition of the benefits of such a strategy might help to explain the large flow of funds from riskier foreign securities markets back to the U.S. capital markets in 1995," says Mandel, who is dean of the college of business administration at Marquette, in Milwaukee.

But developments like this haven't soured bullish analysts like Frank on international funds. Indeed, he asserts, foreign stocks now can be viewed as very attractively priced.

"The pickings in the U.S. market are going to be slimmer from now on," he says. "Meanwhile, the recovery in continental Europe is still in its early stages. The Pacific Rim countries have been growing, are growing, and will continue to grow."

Certainly, foreign stock markets have come back strong in the past from periods of a year or two in which they lagged behind U.S. stocks.

But as the latest slow stretch has clearly demonstrated, waiting for the payoff in international investing can be a real test of both patience and conviction.

With CBS shareholders approving the company's \$5.4 billion merger with Westinghouse Electric Thursday, Westinghouse is planning to slash at least \$70 million in costs from the troubled No. 3 broadcasting giant — a move that will mean big layoffs for the company, Wall Street sources said.

Everyone from CBS Broadcast Group President Peter Lund to stagehands are wondering whether they will be around under the Westinghouse regime. That's what amid reports that David Letterman, CBS' biggest star, is dissatisfied with the network's lackluster ratings. News stars Don Hewitt and Mike Wallace also have been critical of CBS' handling of a recent '60 Minutes' report on the tobacco industry.

While it's unclear how many jobs will go, Westinghouse has laid off analysts on the Street that it plans to boost its bottom line by as much as \$300 million in two years with job cuts and squeezing more revenue out of its local stations.

"If I was at CBS now, I'd be thinking about getting my resume together," said Dennis McAlpine, a media analyst with Joseph, Lyon & Ross. He believes Westinghouse will try to shave \$70 million in costs from its news and corporate operations.

# THE ACES ON BRIDGE®

Bobby Wolff

*'A man's habit elings  
And he will wear tomorrow what

Habitually, declarer gives priority to using dummy's "finesses" trumps to ruff his losers, disregarding opposing trumps with his own holding. Usually, this approach works best. Occasionally, one must reverse the process. The trick to recognize when it's time to do it.

After an approving look at dummy, South played swiftly. Since he could discard one of his small clubs on a high diamond, all he needed were two club ruffs in dummy. This proved to be a task more difficult than it appeared. South drew one more trump and played his ace and king of clubs. The ace survived; the king did not. West ruffed impudently and the grand slam fell on its head.

South was a victim of his own habitual approach. He saw only the possibility of ruffing his own losers with dummy's trumps. The grand slam is virtually guaranteed if he wins dummy's ace with the master hand and ruffs dummy's losers instead.

After winning the trump lead, South should cash dummy's diamond ace and ruff a low diamond. Two dummy entries in spades allow South to ruff two more low diamonds and South is home. He overtakes his last trump in dummy to draw the last trump and he has an easy claim for his 13 winners.

Was it unlucky to find West with a singleton club? Yes, it was. However, barring a first-round diamond ruff, the dummy-reversal plan was the superior choice and South's penalty was self-inflicted.

Q: Someone told me that Dan Butler, the handsome, macho-looking actor who plays Bob "Bull dog" Breece on "Beverly Hills, 90210" is gay. Is this true? — C.W. A: A recent full-page advertisement in the Hollywood trade newspaper showed a picture of



Butler and handsome Dan under a caption which says, "I'm not a straight man, but I play one on television."

Yes, Butler has declared himself gay. He did so to support Human Rights Campaign's National Coming Out Day. The event highlights the entertainment industry's opposition to discrimination against gays in showbiz. Butler's coming out, he says, has been greeted with love and support.

Q: We've heard hints that Angelica Huston is seriously considering a complete physical make-over by plastic surgery. Is this classy actress that long up on her physical appearance? — D.L.

A: Huston, 44, is a genuine Hollywood rarity, an actress past 40 who has not considered plastic surgery as a beauty option. She explains it this way: "I broke my nose when I was younger, and it had to be reconstructed — that was painful enough." And besides, Huston says, the constant beauty abuse that leads to cosmetic surgery seems undignified.

Huston's career hasn't suffered any. She'll soon be opposite Jack Nicholson — her former lover of 17 years — in "The Crossing Guard," and she looks great.

Q: Didn't Bonnie Hunt land the starring role in her own new TV series because of her romantic involvement with David Letterman? — J.D.

A: Bonnie is a relative newcomer. And, yes, her part in newcomers don't often star in TV sitcoms with their names in the title. The new CBS show has Hunt playing a TV reporter trying to make a

new life for herself at an independent station in Chicago.

Hunt, 32, is in fact a Windy City native who, from 1983-87, made a name for herself by performing with the renowned Second City comedy troupe. After her stint in several movies, she appeared on "Late Night with David Letterman" a few years back. She clicked with David, and the two became friends.

Letterman is a fervent Hunt booster. He was the executive producer, along with Hunt, of the first sitcom in which she played the central character ("The Bonnie Hunt Show," which aired briefly on CBS in 1993); he holds the same title for "The Bonnie Hunt Show." As for romantic ties between the two, forget it. He was as openly married.

Q: I thought "NYPD Blue" star Jimmy Smits was occasional in "My Family." Are any more big-screen projects in the works for him? — A.A.

A: I think there will be quite a few. New Line Cinema, the studio that brought "My Family" to the big screen, intends to use Smits in a number of future projects. The folks at New Line are so thrilled with his performance in "My Family" that they are betting Smits will be nominated for an Oscar for Best Actor.

Q: Could it be true that Heidi Fleiss, who grabbed all those headlines when she was accused of being a madam with big-name Hollywood clients, is currently appearing in a mainstream movie under a different name? — K.D.

A: Heidi has a big part in "The Doom Generation," a black comedy focusing on promiscuous teens. Her part isn't particularly sexy, though, as she's seen only briefly in a convenience-store clerk. And her lines don't contain a single reference to her more infamous, real-life identity.

Fleiss did not shy away from using her own name.

Q: There's been a rumor for years that Millie Berle had an affair with Marilyn Monroe. Is there any truth to it? — D.E.

A: Milton Berle is an

amazing television phenomenon. The veteran comedian was born in 1908 and is still active and performing in public. In addition to various club dates and TV appearances, Uncle Millie has a new video out in which he is the emcee of an exercise class, of all things, for senior citizens. Berle says he has no plans to retire. At 87, his wit is still sharp.

For years on the inside showbiz track, Berle was renowned for being a womanizer. He fondly remembers Marilyn Monroe, with

whom he is said to have had a relationship when she was in her early '20s. Berle won't comment on that rumor — that he may be why it has never died.

Q: Supermodel Linda Evangelista on the cover of *Cigar Aficionado* magazine. Can it be that cigar-smoking has become the new rage of the '90s among world-famous women? — P.L.

A: It certainly seems that way. Puffing pretties who light up now include "Goldeneye" femme fatale Famke Janssen, Jennifer Tilly, Rebecca Brunsard (Jack Nicholson's sweetie), Demi Moore, who's soon due out in "The Juror," and Sharon Stone, who shines brighter than Las Vegas in "Casino."

Q: I heard that TV host Greg Kinnear bought a superexpensive new house and car. Is this low-key, appealing and droll man "going Hollywood"? Like all the rest? — G.S.

A: As NBC's late-night "Later With Greg Kinnear" proves, he remains a TV talk-show host of real

promise. His career was launched after hosting the goofy E Channel cable TV show, "Talk Soup," which satirically comments on an assortment of outrageous clips from the daily talk-show confessional grind.

Then Hollywood began to view Kinnear, 31, in another light. He was cast as the handsome playboy-type in Sidney Pollack's "Sabrina," a remake of Billy Wilder's 1954 film co-starring Audrey Hepburn and William Holden (Kinnear takes over the Holden role). The film, due out by Christmas, is expected to launch Greg's big-screen career.

This summer, Kinnear bought a Mediterranean-style villa in the Hollywood Hills, plunking down some \$1.4 million for the four-bedroom place, complete with swimming pool. Obviously, Greg is making more money these days. He may be "going Hollywood," but in my book, he's earned it.

Q: It seems that just about every big star, from Schwarzenegger to Stallone, has bragged on TV talk shows that he did all, or at least most, of his stunts. Are they all this brave and stunt-savvy? — O.L.

A: As true as, even if some of these big stars wanted to, their studio bosses wouldn't allow it because an injury could be near-fatal to their careers. The stunts are prob-

ably prohibited by contract anyway.

Stunt specialists, who do the actual dirty work, aren't crazy about the stars' boasting. One stunt double told me, "If all those guys really do their own dangerous work on screen, then how come the credits list the names of so many stunt professionals? We're the ones who put our lives on the line. And we're stunt machos stars bragging about their own prowess on talk shows."

Q: I heard that Eddie Murphy is reading a documentary on the royal family. Is this true? — K.L.

A: It's true that Murphy is

preparing a project on the royals, but it's a wild, wacky movie, just like his previous, so-to-be-released

"The Nutty Professor" — not a documentary, by any means.

In this comedy, Murphy joins forces with John Lloyd, creator of British TV hit "Blackadder" and "Spitting Image." And as if the royal family hasn't been fodder for enough jokes already, the film, called "Lady Salisbury," is a spoof about a murder in the royal family.

Fairchild's return to daytime television (she was in "Search for Tomorrow" as a very young actress) as wealthy, gorgeous and often ruthless conglomerate executive Sydney Chase.

"Loving" has undergone a complete metamorphosis. The result: "The City." The fictional town of Corinth is but a dim memory as 12 cast members have moved to New York City's SoHo. The main interior setting is a multi-level loft building which houses the various characters. The pacing has been picked up to resemble prime-time television, and the production shooting (which producers promise will be a staple of the soap) adds greatly to the look and texture of the daytime drama.

Ms. Fairchild brings with her a vitality and excitement that is instantaneous, beginning with her wonderful entrance as her helicopter lands on the roof of a building with the New York City skyline glistening in the background. Sydney Chase is the kind of daytime character that generally falls into the (SET ITAL)grande dame(EN ITAL) pose, but Ms. Fairchild and the writers have avoided the cliché.

Sydney Chase is multifaceted in both her business dealings and her private life. She'll play chess with a hustler in Washington Square Park and take the two dollars she has won, or she will

shrug off the ardent attention of one of her lovers, telling him to go back to his wife after he announces he has left the little woman.

The shadings of Sydney Chase's character are infinite and Morgan Fairchild has found the right groove, portraying the character with total conviction. When asked to describe Sydney Chase, the quick-witted actress replied, "Sydney Chase is Rupert Murdoch in drag."

As for the rest of the cast, there's Catherine Hickland's Tess Wilder, who runs a modeling agency in the loft building owned by Ms. Chase; Debbi Morgan and Darrell Williams as Dr. Angela Hubbard and Jacob Foster, respectively, who plan to open a free medical clinic; Roscoe Born as Nick Rivers, a musician who returns to New York City after riding the success of fame and failure; Corey Page as tabloid reporter Richard Wilkins, who defies Sydney Chase and must pay the price for that defiance; and many other colorful characters.

"The City" should set a precedent. And if it catches on with viewers, you can be sure that other soaps will be doing some vital revamping, too.
