Deal averts 3rd federal shutdown

Lawmakers OK pact to keep government open; Senate, Clinton expected to sign on

WASHINGTON — Congressional Republicans and the White House agreed to a deal Thursday to head off a third government shutdown.

The Clinton administration also kept pressure on the GOP to raise the debt ceiling, warning that otherwise the Social Security checks for March will be paid late.

If the debt ceiling is not raised, those checks will not clear," Treasury Secretary Robert Rubin told reporters.

The deal averting a shutdown provides temporary government funding through March 15. Without it, money would run out tonight.

An overall budget deal still eludes President Clinton and Congress. But Republicans have dropped their strategy, which backed in the polls, of trying to use shutdowns to wring concessions.

Rep. Bob Livingston, R-La., chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, said the White House had agreed to eliminate 10 "minor" programs to save money as the price for GOP support, including some education grants.

The deal also placates pro-life GOP conservatives by barring federal spending on embryo research and cutting funds for international family-planning programs.

The House passed the legislation Thursday night, and the Senate was expected to follow suit today.

The administration is pressing for a no-strings-attached increase of the nation's \$4.9 trillion debt ceiling to avert a first-ever default on Feb. 29 or March 1. Republicans want to tie that to more spending cuts and a modest tax cut.

On Wednesday, Moody's Investors Service warned it might have to downgrade its rating on \$387 billion in U.S. bonds.

Internet users crowd phone lines

TWIN FALLS — Do your relatives complain they constantly get a busy signal? Are friends starting to call your neighbors, begging them to run over to your house and give you pressing messages?

Are you starting to track up more time on-line than you do in front of the television — or in bed?

You're probably not alone: More and more people in the Magic and Wood River

valleys are telecommuting, surfing the Internet and snuffing "small mail" for e-mail.

And that has spurred a flurry of local Internet providers, including Project Mutual Telephone Co. in Rupert, Filer Mutual Telephone Co., Idaho Computer Service Inc. in Twin Falls and Micron Internet Services in Boise.

"It's been well-received," said John Gunn, general manager of Filer Mutual. The company started offering Internet access 30 days ago and has Filer, Hollister and Jackpot customers.

"Right now, we've probably got 70; and we're going to ready to turn up Buhl" and Castleford, Gunn said.

The popularity also is a boon for US West as businesses and residences add more telephone lines so people can keep voice lines free while they're faxing, e-mailing or surfing the Net.

"There's a tremendous amount of growth — I would call it explosive growth — with second telephone lines," US West

Hillary Rodham Clinton Ready to testify

Mrs. Clinton makes historic grand jury appearance today

WASHINGTON — The Whitewater probe will splash into history Friday when Hillary Rodham Clinton becomes the first ever first lady to testify before a grand jury.

At 2 p.m. Clinton will face Whitewater special prosecutors and up to 23 grand jurors to answer questions about the disappearance and mysterious discovery of her long-sought legal records, along with their contents.

Federal law bars her from bringing her lawyers, aides and even Secret Service bodyguards into the bleak grand jury room on the third floor of the federal courthouse near the Capitol.

If the first lady wants to ask her top lawyer, David Kendall, a question about her testimony, she must leave the room to confer with him.

Aides said they believed Clinton never before has testified before a grand jury.

"This is a very unpleasant experience," Joseph DiGenova, a former special prosecutor, told reporters. "People become very uncomfortable."

On three occasions, lead Whitewater special prosecutor Kenneth Starr took sworn depositions

Gray wolves await release in central Idaho wilds

STANLEY — U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service officials used snowmobiles on Thursday to move eight Canadian gray wolves into central Idaho's Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness for release.

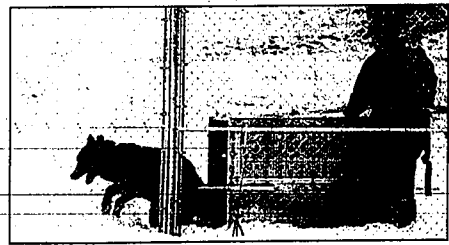
Snowmobiles were blazing a 23-mile trail through seven-foot-deep snow to Dagger Falls, just upstream from Boundary Creek on the Middle Fork of the Salmon River. Boundary Creek, about 45 miles northwest of Stanley, is a popular launching site for rafters.

Dagger Falls is about 15 air miles from Indian Creek, the site to which Fish and Wildlife Service officials had hoped to transport the wolves via Missoula, Mont., by helicopter.

Instead, biologist Megan Parker said, about 20 people — including Wolf Education and Research Center staffers from Ketchum — operated 10 snowmobiles in blizzard conditions until about 9:30 p.m. Wednesday. The group camped on the trail Wednesday night and set out again Thursday morning.

The bad weather on Wednesday mirrored the first release of gray wolves in Idaho last January

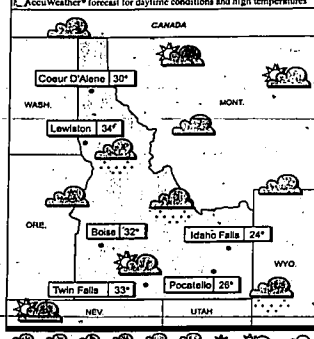
Wildlife officials this week began releasing 11 wolves into Yellowstone Park. A central Idaho release is next.

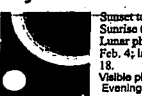

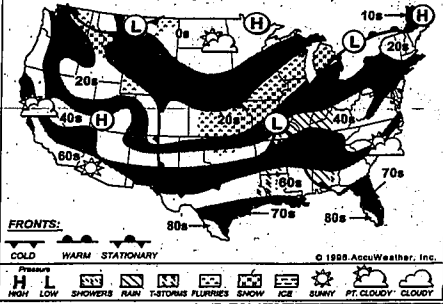

Snow doesn't go away in West; rain pelts South

In West Virginia, the Ohio River crept over its banks Thursday for the second time in a week, causing some minor flooding. In North Kentucky, at least 25 families evacuated their homes because of the rising water.
International Falls, Minn., plunged 39 below zero Thursday morning, breaking the previous record of 37 below set in 1966. However, Roseau and Ely, Minn., were colder at 42 below, the lowest reported for the lower 48 states. The mid-day high was 78 in Homestead, Fla.

Killer faces Utah firing squad

POINT OF THE MOUNTAIN, Utah (AP) — A child killer who said he would rather die at the point of a rifle than fastened flat on a gurney awaited the nation's first execution by firing squad in 19 years early Friday.
John Albert Taylor, 36, was scheduled to be hanged at 12:01 p.m. at Utah State Prison by anonymous marksmen firing the same type of deer rifle used to execute Gary Gilmore at the same institution in 1977.
"Taylor had his first cigarette in six years as he was led to maximum security to the death-waiting cell, prison spokesman Randy Rippling said. As he walked there Thursday night, he ate pizza with his family and met with the Catholic priest who baptized him last week."
Under Utah law, Taylor was offered the choice of lethal injection or firing squad. Idaho is the only other state to have a firing squad as one of its methods of execution.
Taylor said he chose the firing squad because it would be a costly inconvenience to the state and because he feared "flipping around like a fish out of water" if given an injection.
He also hoped the method would more dramatically underscore his claim that his death would be state-sanctioned murder.
Gov. Mike Leavitt said the state had no obligation to make the execution dignified and orderly. "There is

nothing but sadness in this event," Leavitt said.
"This is the highest penalty that society can exact on a man who has committed the most difficult task government could be delegated."
"They say executing him is so barbaric," said the victim's mother, Sherron King. "Tell me what's barbaric. My daughter was alive (while being raped and choked). He won't even hear the sound of the bullets."
Taylor had insisted on being wrongfully convicted. But he abruptly dropped all appeals and fired his lawyer in December, determined to die now rather than spend years confined to a death-row cell for 23 hours a day.
Wearing a black hood, he was to be strapped into a steel chair 23 feet from five executioners, a white cloth target pinned over his heart and a pile of sandbags behind him.

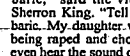

Last year, US West saw a 5 percent growth overall of installed lines in Buhl and Twin Falls, and it was even a bit more in Blaine County, Berry said.

The company started out with five lines and had to put in 10 the first week, he said.
The company has more than 400 subscribers accessing its Rupert and

Twin Falls numbers and saw a significant increase in business at Christmas time, Campbell said. We expect that was because of gift giving and new computer owners," Campbell said.
US West also has encountered some problems with the on-line career. While homes in newer neighborhoods were built to have multiple telephone lines, some older neighborhoods aren't prepared for the multiple-line trend and have to be overhauled, Berry said.

Lugar: Dark horse of different color

WASHINGTON (AP) — Among Republican presidential rivals, Indiana Sen. Dan Lugar is a dark horse of a different color.

When others talk flat taxes, Lugar answers national sales tax. Mention welfare reform and Lugar says save school lunches. Suggest the Cold War's over and Lugar reminds that the nuclear threat still exists. A gun control proponent, he also wants to keep the ban on most assault weapons.

Then there's foreign policy. Well, that's something the former chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee can talk about. Endlessly.

"Face it, he's smart, he's nice, he's straight and he's clear," says Charles Jones, former president of the American Political Science Association. "And none of this is going to work very well to get him to the White House."

In a year in which the candidates are hotly vying for the GOP nomination in typical point-counterpoint fashion — Bob Dole the Tested Leader vs. Steve Forbes the Flat Taxer, Pat Buchanan the Conservative, Lamar Alexander the Outsider and Phil Gramm the Budgeteer — Lugar goes his own way. No attack ads, no snide remarks — and no gains in his national profile.

He says his first act as president would be to call the leader in Russia. He certainly didn't get that idea from any pollster.

"He's running his own race," says Lewis Gould, a presidential historian at the University of Texas. "It's nice to see a candidate with his own ideas in a time when so many are pandering to the electorate and polls. He's true to himself."

"Terry Holt, Lugar's press secretary, says his boss didn't purposely mix up his campaign trails — traveled agenda in order to distinguish himself from the pack. "It's just

Lugar being Lugar," he says.

Asked to explain Lugar's approach, Holt replies, "The strategy is to continue to demonstrate he is an independent thinker and truth teller."

Lugar, whose pet peeve is pandering, says his goal is to finish his campaign with his head held high. "If not everybody votes for me, at least hope they have respect for what I'm saying after the campaign," he said after announcing his candidacy last spring.

But respect doesn't earn much political patronage anymore.

"What you need to get elected and what you need to govern are two different things," said political analyst

Henry Graf of Columbia University. Lugar, a faithful Republican, shares many beliefs with his brethren. He's against abortion, wary of affirmative action quotas and for a balanced budget amendment. He wants to pare government, reduce farm subsidies and close the Education Department.

But, unlike many fellow Republicans, Lugar wants to preserve the ban on assault-style weapons, continue to welcome immigrants and dump the federal income tax system in favor of a 17 percent national sales tax.

Lugar, 63, barely registers on most polls nationally or in the early cam-

paign test states of New Hampshire and Iowa, but he drew attention at the end of December for running a series of chilling nuclear terrorism TV ads.

The ads — a four-part dramatization of a possible terrorist attack on the United States — drew snide remarks from some rivals, who otherwise were too busy attacking one another to give Lugar much thought.

The former Eagle Scout and Rhodes scholar wasn't paying his rivals much mind either. "Lugar next ran ads stressing his successful effort to save the federal school lunch program, which was on the chopping block under GOP welfare reform proposals.

Clinton decides he will sign defense bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Clinton has decided to sign a \$265 billion defense bill despite objections to a provision forcing service members with the AIDS virus out of the military.

Clinton vetoed a second bill that would raise military pay. Clinton accepted Defense Secretary William Perry's recommendation to approve the measure. A White House memo, a copy of which was obtained Thursday by The Associated Press, indicates the president will vote to change the "remaining objectionable provisions" in subsequent legislation.

After last month's veto of an earlier version of the bill, congressional Republicans removed two provisions opposed by Clinton and weakened a third.

The Senate was expected to pass the bill Friday and send it to Clinton.

White House press secretary Mike McCurry confirmed Perry's recommendation on the bill and told reporters at a briefing: "I believe the president will accept that recommendation."

McCurry said other measures Clinton opposes include a ban on abortions at overseas military hospitals, ship contracts earmarked for yards in the home states of influential lawmakers, buy-America require-

ments that Perry says could raise Pentagon costs and "a lot of micromanaging of the Defense Department itself that we think is unwarranted."

The defense authorization bill adds \$7 billion in military spending beyond what Clinton requested. In addition to the AIDS measure, Republicans added spending provisions to expand the B-2 bomber fleet, build transport ships and increase research into missile defense.

The bill also provides 2.4 percent military pay raises and other perks for uniformed forces at a time when Clinton has dispatched thousands of U.S. troops to Bosnia. To avoid another veto, Republicans agreed to delete provisions that would have required construction of a U.S. missile defense system by 2003 and restricted the president's power to place troops under U.N. command. A requirement that Clinton go to Congress for approval of even small-scale troop deployments was turned into a nonbinding resolution reflecting nothing more than congressional wishes.

MCI wins last FCC satellite TV license

WASHINGTON (AP) — Plans by MCI and media magnate Rupert Murdoch to deliver television and other services directly to homes via satellite moved a crucial step forward Thursday. MCI won the last remaining license to do so.

With a bid of \$682.5 million, MCI came away the winner of a Federal Communications Commission auction.

MCI and Murdoch's News Corp. are teaming up to develop a range of consumer and business services for television as well as for computers.

Dole concedes Forbes' attack hurts his lead

WATERLOO, Iowa (AP) — Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, hit with negative ads from his rivals and questions about his ability to compete with President Clinton, complained Thursday that the GOP race seemed at times like "training for the mud-wrestling championship."

Dole also conceded that his campaign's own polling showed his

numbers slipping against millionaire publisher Steve Forbes. But he predicted Forbes' rally would fizzle.

"Dole said a negative advertising campaign by his rivals, and particularly by Forbes, seemed to be cutting into his lead — as shown by recent polls.

In fact, polls have shown Forbes closing the gap with Dole in many states, including Iowa, with its GOP

caucuses on Feb. 12.

An Iowa Project poll of 300 likely caucus goers released Thursday found Dole supported by 26 percent and Forbes by 18 percent. All other candidates were in single digits in the Jan. 22 survey, which had a 6 percentage point margin of error.

Dole said he was not too concerned. "Our own tracking polls show we're going down a bit —

we're hanging in there at about 31 or 32 percent. I think you're going to see a decline in the Forbes (numbers)," he said.

He blamed Forbes' surge in the polls on his negative ads.

"It gives him an advantage, I think, in the short term. I think in the long term, at least I hope in the long term, it backfires," Dole told reporters.

Researchers find new hepatitis virus

WASHINGTON (AP) — Researchers have isolated a previously unknown hepatitis virus, but experts aren't sure if it poses a health danger or even if it can cause disease symptoms.

In a study to be published Friday in the journal Science, a large team of scientists report that a virus identified as hepatitis G, or HGV, was isolated from the blood of patients with chronic hepatitis.

"We have shown some association of this virus with chronic hepatitis," said Patrice Yarbough, director of research at Conelab, TechnoLab, Redwood City, Calif., where much of the work was done. "The implication of this finding is still not known."

Dr. Harvey Alter of the National Institutes of Health, a coauthor of the study, said that although the virus is a newly discovered agent, it probably has been around a long time.

Waldholtz testifies

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Enid Waldholtz testified for a second time Thursday before a federal grand jury investigating allegations that her estranged husband engaged in a \$1.7 million check-kiting scheme and lied to the Federal Election Commission.

Waldholtz, a first-term Republican from Utah, appeared for about three hours before the grand jury at the federal courthouse here.

Mrs. Clinton, grand jury raise questions from public

WASHINGTON (AP) — For the first time, a first lady will appear Friday before a federal grand jury to answer prosecutors' questions — a sign of how far the Whitewater investigation has evolved over the last two years.

Its scope now covers far more than the Arkansas land venture called Whitewater that President Clinton and his wife lost money on during the 1980s in partnership with James and Susan McDougal, the owners of a failing savings and loan.

Here are answers to a few commonly asked questions.

Q: Why is Hillary Rodham Clinton appearing before the grand jury?
A: Mrs. Clinton was subpoenaed by Whitewater-prosecutors to answer questions about how her law firm billing records, which investigators could not find for two years, suddenly showed up inside the White House residence in a room frequented only by the president, the first lady and their visitors.

Being called before a grand jury does not mean a witness has done anything wrong. In this case, it does signal that prosecutors suspect someone may have tried to obstruct the investigation by hiding the records after they were subpoenaed in the early stages of the Whitewater probe. Obstruction of justice is a felony.

Mrs. Clinton will be asked if she has relevant information about discovery of the records. Both President and Mrs. Clinton already have said they had nothing to do with the records' disappearance or discovery. An aide found the documents on a table in the White House residence book room.

Q: What is a grand jury, and what does it do?
A: In most cases, a federal prosecutor is required to present his evidence to a panel of jurors before he can bring felony charges against anyone. Prosecutors elicit testimony under oath from witnesses and present other evidence.

Unlike trial juries, grand juries do not determine innocence or guilt. They decide only whether sufficient evidence exists to justify an indictment. Grand juries usually have 23 members and can hand up an indictment with a simple majority vote.

Q: Why are Mrs. Clinton's billing records important?

A: Investigators have wanted the records since late 1993 to help determine whether Mrs. Clinton or the Rose Law Firm was involved in any wrongdoing that might have contributed to the failure of the McDougals' savings and loan. The first lady denies doing anything wrong in her legal work on Madison Guaranty. James McDougal was acquitted in 1990 of charges stemming from the institution's failure. Whitewater prosecutors recently indicted him again on other charges related to the thrift's demise.

Madison failed in the late 1980s at a cost to taxpayers of \$65 million. Mrs. Clinton worked 60 hours over 15 months on Madison Guaranty business, including some on Castle Grande.

Before the billing records were discovered and turned over to investigators this month, Mrs. Clinton described — under oath — her work for Madison as "minimal" and said she had not worked on one of the savings and loan's most controversial land deals, called Castle Grande.

The newly discovered records indicate Mrs. Clinton worked 60 hours over 15 months on Madison Guaranty business, including some on Castle Grande.

Q: What is the status of the criminal investigation?
A: Whitewater independent counsel Kenneth Starr was appointed by a federal court panel to investigate Whitewater. The probe had cost more than \$9 million through last October and had resulted in more than a dozen guilty pleas or indictments of Arkansas accused of wrongdoing. Among them was Webster Hubbell, a former associate attorney general and law partner of Mrs. Clinton who pleaded guilty to defrauding the firm and its clients. The McDougals and current Arkansas Gov. Jim Guy Tucker are awaiting trial on fraud charges.

Q: What are the most serious allegations?
A: Much of the investigation has centered on business deals in Arkansas that prosecutors believe caused Madison's demise, including

some connected to a federally backed lending company operated by former minister judge David Hale. Hale has pleaded guilty and is cooperating with prosecutors — Charges — against McDougal and Tucker stem from the interlocking relationship between the savings and loan and Hale's company that prosecutors alleged was used to siphon federally insured money from both operations.

Attention also has been given to Hale's allegation that Clinton, as Arkansas governor, pressured him in 1986 to make an improper \$300,000 federally backed loan to the McDougals. The loan was never repaid and is part of the McDougals' indictment. The president denies having anything to do with the loan.

In recent months, prosecutors have also been investigating the financing of Clinton's political campaigns, particularly the 1990 campaign run by current White House adviser Bruce Lindsey. Among the issues is whether the campaigns received improper donations or help from banks and whether supporters like McDougal were given improper favors from Clinton. A former president of a bank involved in Clinton's 1990 campaign has pleaded guilty.

In Washington, prosecutors have examined whether anyone in the Clinton administration has tried to derail the investigation. Mrs. Clinton's grand jury appearance is part of that probe.

Q: What other investigations of Whitewater are going on?

A: Two other investigations are under way. One is before the Senate Whitewater Committee, chaired by Republican Sen. Alfonse D'Amato of New York. It is an information-gathering probe for Congress.

That probe has cost taxpayers about \$900,000; the committee recently requested an additional \$600,000.

A second is being conducted by federal banking regulators, who must determine whether to sue to recover taxpayers' losses in Madison. That probe recently concluded that although the Whitewater-land venture may have caused some small losses to the savings and loan, grounds did not exist for suing President or Mrs. Clinton, because they were passive investors. It has left open the possibility that Mrs. Clinton's former law firm could be sued.

FCC adds new toll-free code

WASHINGTON (AP) — Coming soon to a telephone near you: 1-888. The 888 prefix goes into use March 1 for toll-free calls. It will not replace 800 numbers, but rather will be an additional code.

The Federal Communications Commission adopted a plan Thursday for introducing the second toll-free exchange.

The agency's top telephone regulator, Gina Keeney, cautioned that the 800 and 888 codes

will not be interchangeable. "Let's say you dial 1-800-555-5555," she said. "If you dial 1-888-555-5555 that's going to be a different place. The new 888 number is comparable to an area code."

The FCC is adding the 888 code because the pool of available 800 numbers is expected to run out by the spring. The agency said just 600,000 numbers remain available.

By using the 888 prefix, telephone companies will have about

7.5 million new numbers to sell, the FCC said.

Beginning Feb. 10, AT&T, MCI, Sprint and other telephone companies that provide toll-free service can begin taking reservations from companies for specific 888 numbers.

About 310,000 "vanity" numbers using the 888 prefix also have been requested, the FCC said. Those requests will be set aside until the FCC decides how it wants to distribute vanity numbers.

O.J. campaigns to win back U.S. hearts

LOS ANGELES (AP) — In his first TV interview since the slayings of his ex-wife and her friend, O.J. Simpson sought to win back the hearts and minds of America, imploring viewers to believe he is not a killer but telling them: "If you don't like me, leave me alone... I did not commit those murders," Simpson said.

"I couldn't kill anyone, and I don't

know of anyone who was involved." He lauded his slain ex-wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, as a great mother and "next to my mom, my most favorite person on this Earth." He said he would mourn her death forever.

In the live, hour-long interview Wednesday night with Black Entertainment Television's Ed

Gordon, a composed but sometimes emotional Simpson made an impassioned plea to the public to accept his acquittal. He also expressed anger at relatives of the victims.

He reminded the audience of several million about the old O.J., the football hero, sportsstar, commercial pitchman and movie actor.

Delaware double murderer dies in 3rd hanging since '65

SMYRNA, Del. (AP) — A man who murdered an elderly couple 17 years ago went to the gallows early Thursday, the nation's third execution by hanging since 1965.

Billy Bailey stood in the cold wind and grimaced after climbing the steps to the wooden structure. He occasionally glanced at the witnesses 15 feet below, including the victims' two sons, as the hangman's noose swung gently back and forth.

He closed his eyes, sniffed and said nothing before the black hood was placed over his head, followed by the noose. At 12:04 a.m., the warden pulled a lever, the trap door opened and Bailey dropped.

His body twisted quickly in the wind, then turned slowly beneath the platform. He was pronounced dead 11 minutes later.

"I think it's really past time this

should have come about. It's been too many years," said Mary Ann Lamberton, a daughter-in-law of the victims.

Bailey has said he was drinking heavily the day of the slayings and doesn't remember killing the couple with Lamberton's shotgun. Police believe he planned to steal the couple's pickup.

Asked at a pardons board hearing last week why he did it, Bailey said, "I don't really know. I just know that I feel bad about it."

By coincidence, Utah is scheduled to have its first firing squad execution in 19 years early Friday. John Albert Taylor, sentenced to die for raping and strangling an 11-year-old girl, chose the firing squad over injection, the state's second method of execution since Utah outlawed hanging in 1963.

College presidents urge tax alternatives

BOISE - The presidents of Idaho's two community colleges urged legislative budget writers on Thursday to find some creative way to reduce their schools' reliance on local property taxes and still maintain the kind of quality programs needed to assure the integrity of Idaho's labor force.

Gerald Meyerhoefer of the College of Southern Idaho told the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee that property-tax support should not be completely eliminated because the community support makes the



educational program even stronger.

But with Robert Bennett of North Idaho College, Meyerhoefer told the committee that the level of property tax support should be reduced, considering the role the schools play

in the statewide educational network.

"We have to look at what we think is a fairness issue," Meyerhoefer said. Property taxes in the new budget will total just over \$9 million for the two schools while state support will be about \$11.5 million. Student fees make up the rest of the operating cash.

Bennett, however, seemed much more concerned about declining federal support for community colleges and the potential that voters will adopt the new 1 percent cap on property taxes that would preclude any property tax support for education.

"The problem is the demand for education services is increasing, and if the federal government doesn't want to pay for it and the local government doesn't want to pay for it, it lands back in your lap—and the students," Bennett told the budget writers.

"Where you're going to get the money, I don't know," he said, getting a short answer to an increase in the liquor surcharge with the new cash earmarked for junior colleges. "That's your problem."

"But please put your thinking caps on because that cloud is hanging over us and it's about to rain," he said.

Craig blasts forest protectors

WASHINGTON - Western conservatives, deeply critical of the Forest Service's declining timber production and allegedly inefficient management, said Thursday they expect changes and may propose new legislation to force the issue.

Called by Sen. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, several Forest Service and General Accounting Office officials testified before a Senate forestry panel that they are conducting audits and will be prepared to offer their report and concrete suggestions later this year. It was the 15th and final oversight hearing conducted by the Forests and Public Land Management Subcommittee on the topic.

"There needs to be some accountability," Craig said during the hearing, which was attended by only two other Republicans with timber interests in their states, Sen. Craig Thomas of Wyoming and Sen. Frank Murkowski of Alaska.

"There is a level of frustration on the ground," Craig said. "The Forest Service needs to provide predictability on the ground, or we need to find another agency to manage the land."

Last year, the Forest Service produced

the least number of timber sales in any year since the program started in 1959, the lawmakers charged.

The federal officials did say there are updates needed in their work from the nitty gritty of interagency consultations to overarching objectives for use of the 200 million acres of Forest Service land.

But Assistant Secretary of Agriculture James Lyons, who oversees the Forest Service, said the agency is mired in increasingly complex laws set by Congress and self-imposed regulations resulting from an "evolution" in their mission from timber production to a "management approach."

"Today National Forest System management emphasizes maintenance of ecosystem health to sustain the production of all the goods and services which derive from the national forests, including timber, forage, fish and wildlife, recreation, wilderness and water," he said.

To comply with all the environmental reviews and documentation - on which the GAO reports the Forest Service

spends \$250 million a year and 30 percent of staff resources - many timber sales are now costly to taxpayers.

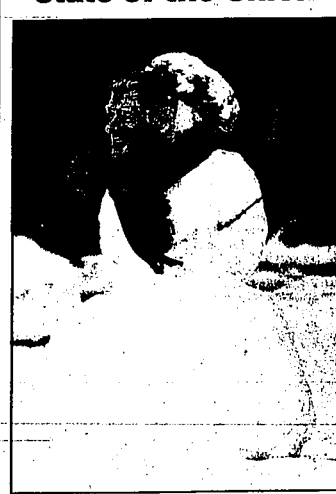
"Increasingly, there are conflicts with the rules. It makes it hard to manage," Thomas said, referring to the laws and regulations administered by different agencies on the same land. But he added that he was not offering sympathy, but seeking to spur change.

Timber-minded lawmakers say they believe the forest management process needs to be simplified, but enough environmental safeguards should be left to insulate the agency from lawsuits. Simpler rules will provide for faster, cheaper and increased timber sales to boost the slumping industry.

But some critics of below-cost timber cutting say the sales should stop altogether. Environmentalists charge that simplifying the process means scaling back environmental protections and that could lead to permanent harm to water, air, endangered species, as well as recreation and tourism industries.

They say one example already in law is the so-called salvage rider that, in the name of forest health, mandates extensive logging of dead and healthy trees inevitably off-limits without being subjected to environmental reviews.

Auger dam already has permit

TWIN FALLS - He doesn't have a permanent one, but the Salt Lake City developer seeking to build a major hydroelectric plant on the Snake River at Auger Falls already has a temporary construction permit issued by the Idaho Department of Lands.

In fact, Cogeneration Inc. President Steve Harmsen already has paid the public his tax, or if they're going to hold a token public hearing and go ahead and approve it," said Laird Lucas, Boise-based attorney with the Land and Water Fund of the Rockies. Lucas is preparing to sue the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for granting Cogeneration a permit to build the dam.

Harmsen wants to build a low dam, technically a "weir," across the Snake River less than three miles

west of the Perrine Bridge. A minimum of 750 cubic feet of water per second would spill over the dam, while up to 5,000 cfs would flow through a 1.7-mile canal to a powerhouse near the mouth of Rock Creek. One cfs equals 449 gallons per minute.

If built, the project would generate 43.6 megawatts of electricity; one megawatt is a million watts.

In addition to electricity, the Auger Falls hydroelectric project would generate a wealth of civic amenities, Brock said.

Specifically, Harmsen has offered to dedicate public hiking trails, ponds and river access on land he

U.S. Forest Service drops road plan for Hells Canyon

BAKER CITY, Ore. (AP) — The U.S. Forest Service has dropped a Hells Canyon road-building project conservationists and hunters said would harm wildlife.

Wallawa-Whitman National Forest had planned to widen and resurface six miles of gravel road, build two new miles of road and build three overlooks on the canyon's west rim.

The Baker County Chamber of Commerce opposed the project as a way to increase tourism in northeastern Oregon. Conservationists sued to block the development, saying it would threaten Rocky Mountain elk.

Instead, Wallawa-Whitman National Forest Supervisor Bob Richmond said Wednesday, the forest will add parking spaces, loading ramps, toilets and other amenities at two west rim camp-

grounds and improve parking at a third.

Richmond also plans to reduce five miles of primitive roads to reduce maintenance costs and erosion, Richmond said he wanted to

ensure the forest has enough money to maintain popular roads such as the Hells Canyon and Elkhorn Drive national scenic byways.

"We better try to maintain the infrastructure we have and not add

anything to it," he said.

Ric Bailey, executive director of the Hells Canyon Preservation Council, called Richmond's decision a "real surprise."

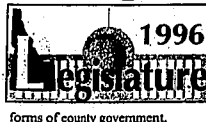
"The Forest Service was adamant about ramming this project through regardless of the effects or public opposition," Bailey said. "I didn't think anything short of a court order would stop them."

Larry Griffith, executive director of the Baker County Chamber of Commerce, called the decision disappointing.

"What we're seeing is not a decision to never build another overlook, but a decision based on the Forest Service's fiscal constraints," Griffith said. "We're certainly not ready to give up on the concept."

Idaho House passes bill allowing change in counties



BOISE (AP) — More than a year after voters approved the idea, Idaho lawmakers are moving closer to allowing alternative forms of county government.

The House voted 63-7 on Thursday for a bill to allow counties to change their system of government, if voters agree. A companion measure, which would allow the convening of commissions to draw up county charters, was approved 55-15.

Both measures now head to the Senate, where it is likely there will be an attempt to amend the main bill to make it easier to put changes before the voters.

Since statehood in 1900, all Idaho counties have been controlled by three-member commissions, with elected sheriffs, prosecutors, treasury clerks, assessors and coroners.

Boise (AP) — More than a year after voters approved the idea, Idaho lawmakers are moving closer to allowing alternative forms of county government.

The House on Thursday voted 63-7 to allow counties to opt for a commissioner-manager form of government, an elected county executive; commissions of three, five or seven members with changes in one or more of the other county offices, or consolidation or elimination of county offices. Counties would have no more or less authority than they have now.

In every case, the proposed would have to run against the current form of government and win a majority.

County commissions could put the question before voters or a vote could be forced by petition. But that requirement would be fairly stiff — 20 percent of the people who voted in the last election would have to

sign. That would be about 20,000 signatures in Ada County.

Senate Local Government and Taxation Chairman Jerry Thompson says Republicans said there might be an effort to cut the petition requirement to 10 percent. But the bill's chief sponsor, Rep. Russ Stone, said she would not go along with such a change.

The Boise Republican reminded House members that the 1994 constitutional amendment passed in every county except Clark, and in seven counties by at least a two-thirds supermajority.

"I feel it's very easy about what seems to me to be an extremely complicated procedure for people to understand," he said.

Republican Paul Kjellander of Boise called Stone's legislation a "tremendous launching pad" for change. But Tom Loeferich of Idaho Falls, a former Bonneville County commissioner, said there was nothing wrong with the current system.

Lawmakers mull bill exempting impact fees

BOISE (AP) — Should state government be exempt from paying impact fees to local governments to help them cope with the cost of expansion?

Members of the House State Affairs Committee had mixed feelings Thursday. But they agreed to at least introduce a bill making it clear that the state does not have to pay. Several committee members voted against introduction, indicating the

legislation faces a questionable future.

The Legislature has allowed only Ada County to collect impact fees from builders and developers. The fee is designed to offset the costs associated with growth, such as extending water and sewer lines and roads. The Legislature in recent years has rejected every effort to allow other counties to assess impact fees.

Michael Sheeley, deputy attorney general for the Department of Administration, told lawmakers an attorney general's opinion — which has no legal weight — says state government is not subject to impact fees.

He said making the state pay the fees would be a form of double taxation, and it is clear from the history of the impact-fee law that the Legislature did not intend governmental agencies to pay.

Students may wish for less snow, fewer days of school

BURLEY — Mini-Cassia area students who have missed two or three days of school in the past two weeks because of bad weather can rest easy, school administrators aren't yet looking for a way to make up for those days.

But if another day or two is missed, students can count on making up for lost time, according to officials from Minidoka and Cassia school districts.

Minidoka District Superintendent Michael Bishop, said the last time classes had to be made up because of bad weather was during

the 1992-93 school year when about ten days were missed.

To make up for the last days, Bishop said school days were lengthened and spring break and President's day vacations were skipped.

"Snow days do create some problems down the road but nothing unmanageable," Bishop said. "The state regulations allow for two days out and that is what we have had this year. If we miss more we will probably have to look at some kind of change in our schedule."

Everett Howard, superintendent of the Cassia County School District, said secondary schools are required to provide 990 hours, elementary schools 900 hours and kinder-

gartens are required to provide 450 hours of school each year.

Administrators usually schedule extra days into the school year calendar in case the schools are closed, he said. On this year's calendar most schools in the Cassia district scheduled four to seven extra days.

Cassia schools have been closed three days so far this year.

The main reason school was called off Thursday in both counties was hazardous road conditions.

Bishop said while checking bus routes early Thursday morning he encountered one snow drift close to four feet deep.

"When I came around the corner there was

no lane left and the drift was level with the hood of my four-wheel-drive pickup," he said.

"It blew for so long yesterday and the county crews just didn't get to the outlying roads. We wouldn't have been able to get the buses through."

Howard said early morning checks in Cassia County also showed many drifts and slick roads.

"It was very dangerous conditions, and it was difficult to see the sides of the roads," he said.

If more days are missed and classes have to be rescheduled, Bishop said the administration will present a plan to the School Board.

Meals on Wheels continues despite snow

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Utahns got a big dose of winter Thursday, the second day of a storm that dumped record snowfall and closed schools, snarled highways and shut down state government.

Bill Alder, National Weather Service meteorologist, said the storm dropped 16.5 inches in the 24 hours ending at 2 p.m. MST Thursday, a record for any January day.

"We haven't missed a meal in the 28 years of the program, I'll be darned if we're going to miss any because of this snow," said Meals on Wheels worker Dwight Rasmussen as he trudged through knee-deep snow to take lunch to a 92-year-old woman.

Snow totals ranged from 17 inches at Stansbury Park to 20 in Sandy and 14 in Wendover. The storm hit hardest in Salt Lake County and northward, with Lehi getting 7 inches, Vernal 6 and Cache Valley, 5 inches. Parowan, a southern Utah town where the

snow began falling Thursday afternoon, got 1 inch. Utah ski resorts, which on Wednesday saw a foot or 2 of snow, had recorded up to 2 feet more Thursday.

U.S. 89 through Sardine Canyon between Brigham City and Logan reopened Thursday afternoon, but Little Cottonwood Canyon leading to several ski resorts in the Wasatch Mountains east of Salt Lake remained closed.

Alder said the snow was beginning to hit southern Utah Thursday afternoon, dumping on Cedar City, Bryce Canyon and Richfield. Monticello got 2 inches.

State government offices in Salt Lake were closed Thursday, except for essential services. The Utah Legislature's committee meetings in the morning drew skinny crowds, and afternoon sessions were called off.

Governor doubts execution will affect image

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Gov. Mike Leavitt says he would support a change in a statute that allows condemned Utah inmates to choose to die by firing squad, but doubts the option hurts the state's image.

The Republican governor spoke with reporters Thursday afternoon about that law and convicted child killer John Albert Taylor's scheduled execution at Utah State Prison.

"This is a sad event," Leavitt said. "It's sad for the families of the victim. It's sad for Mr. Taylor. It's very difficult for those who have been given the duty of carrying out the penalty."

The governor said state corrections officials would carefully fol-

low proper protocol throughout the evening to ensure the execution was administered in an "orderly and dignified way."

Taylor, who has insisted he was wrongly convicted of raping and strangling an 11-year-old Washington Terrace girl in 1989, said he chose the firing squad because he wanted to make it more difficult for the state to execute him.

Utah is the only state that lets the condemned choose lethal injection or shooting and is one of only two states that still has the firing squad as an option. Inmates in Idaho can be shot or injected, but the mode of execution is determined by the director of prisons.

Leavitt said he does not believe the firing-squad option will "reflect badly on the state." He pointed out Utah's unprecedented growth, its recognition as one of the most livable states in the nation and selection as the site for the 2002 Winter Olympics.

However, Leavitt said, he still would support altering the statute if the Legislature so chooses. Rep. Cheryl Allen, R-Bountiful, had initially intended to file a bill this session that would make a lethal intravenous injection the state's only execution method.

She has since revised her proposal to focus on taking the choice away from the condemned inmate.

"I'm encouraged about that idea," said Kearns. "The landowners near the Riverside plant are open to the constructed wetlands."

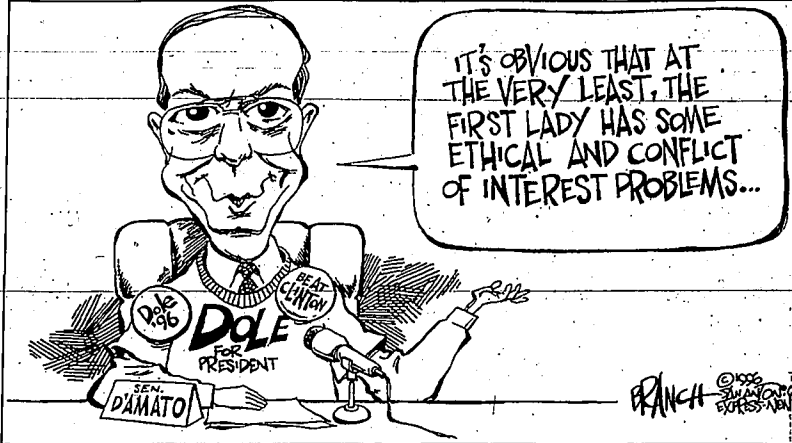

enough voters were appealed enough to end the long Democratic reign in Congress and turn power over to the Republicans. The new congressional majority said enough was enough. They would try to stop or slow down this fiscal lunacy.

Independent studies had shown that unless growth rates of one of the most costly of all federal programs enacted during many years of reckless spending - Medicare - were curbed, it would run out of money in a few years. It was costing far more than anyone anticipated.

So many people benefited from it, however, that it was considered political suicide to do the right thing and trim Medicare's runaway rate of growth.

The new majority decided to take the risk, even though the members' legislative ca-

reers would be threatened. Their political opponents attacked them and their proposals with lies, distortions and demagoguery.

The nub of the debate is how long a nation can get away with spending and borrowing as if there were no tomorrow. A side issue is whether most citizen-voters really know or care about the size of deficits and debt, so long as they benefit from them.

An irony of the Washington fiscal war is that the political party fighting so feverishly against reform traces its origins back to Thomas Jefferson and Andrew Jackson. Jefferson believed that the best government is the least government. Jackson called a national debt "a national disgrace."

My, how things have changed. Finally, the principles of Jefferson and Jackson have resurfaced. Now, let's see if they will stick. This fight in Washington is the acid test.

Investigation into political extortion due for Democrats

If you don't understand why politics disgusts many Americans, listen to Roy Mosman.

Earlier this week, Mosman said the past two Democratic gubernatorial campaigns had squeezed him for money, by threatening part of his livelihood.

Mosman is no lightweight. Besides being a member of the State Board of Education, and he's a well-known Moscow lawyer. His clients include the State Insurance Fund.

That legal work was the subject of the squeeze. He said that in 1990 and 1994, he was told to contribute to the campaigns of Cecil Andrus and Larry EchoHawk - or else forget about working for the insurance fund.

Let's call this what it is, Mosman is alleging corruption and political extortion.

Is the allegation true? It duplicates rumors of strong-arm tactics that circulated at the time. But Andrus denies it. So does EchoHawk's campaign manager.

Those denials don't necessarily prove anything. If some campaign operative put the arm on Mosman and others, the higher-ups were probably insulated. That's called "deniability."

Citizens who have grown cynical through experience may yawn and say this incident is old hat. Politicians always, use their power to enforce loyalty, right?

They do, within limits.

For instance, Greg Nelson, who headed the Idaho Agriculture Department under Andrus, found himself unemployed when Phil Batt became governor last year. Nelson had donated to EchoHawk. A number of other state employees who had backed EchoHawk met a similar fate.

That's not sinister. No governor wants his agencies packed with his political enemies. So anyone with a high-level state job knows the importance of betting on the winning horse.

But Mosman's allegations are different. The difference may seem subtle, but it's important. It's one thing to hire people who share your political philosophy and goals. It's another thing to use the power of office to extort donations.

Also, as a lawyer representing the Insurance Fund, Mosman wasn't even a state employee. He was an independent contractor, doing non-political work. Does this mean you have to back the right party if you want to tend the state's shrubbery?

Mosman refuses to say exactly who put the arm on him. But Attorney General Al Lance and the Idaho Bureau of Investigation should look into his allegation. They should determine whether any laws got broken in the Mosman shakedown - and if so, by whom.

Bosnian Serbs say they will release prisoners

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) — Apparently bowing to pressure from Serbia, Bosnian Serb leaders promised Thursday to release prisoners of war and to fully cooperate with war-crimes investigators.

The Bosnian Serb in charge of POWs, Dragan Bulajic, said he would release the remaining 180 prisoners as soon as the Red Cross could take them.

He said he hoped the Muslim-led government and Bosnian Croats could be persuaded to do the same.

The prisoner exchange is widely seen as a key test of the U.S.-brokered peace accord that took effect last month. But only a third of 900 POWs were freed by the deadline last Friday.

According to the Red Cross, the Bosnian government still holds 318 prisoners and Bosnia Croats, 177.

NATO officials, who are policing the accord, said the failed release was the biggest let-down so far.

The exchange broke down when the Bosnian government insisted that it would not release its prisoners unless

the Serbs accounted for 20,000 Muslims the government says are missing. Many are believed to have been killed when Bosnian Serbs overran the eastern Muslim enclave of Srebrenica in July.

Srebrenica has become synonymous with the atrocities of Bosnia's 3 1/2-year war. During a weekend visit to the area, U.S. Assistant Secretary of State John Shattuck said there is evidence that up to 7,000 people may lie there in mass graves.

Bosnian Serbs say the numbers are

exaggerated but expressed a willingness Thursday to cooperate with investigators. They still refuse to extradite alleged criminals.

Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic — himself under indictment by a U.N.-appointed war crimes tribunal — told Bosnian Serb television he would cooperate fully with investigations of mass graves in Bosnia.

But he added: "All those who committed crimes will be tried in the (Bosnian) Serb Republic."

U.S. Navy frigate rescues 11 Iranians

MANAMA, Bahrain — A U.S. Navy frigate rescued 11 Iranian fishermen who were stranded in the Persian Gulf without food, the Navy said Thursday.

A statement from the Bahrain-based U.S. Naval Forces Central Command said a helicopter from USS Elrod spotted the men's trawler Tuesday afternoon "dead in the water" about 40 miles off Kuwait City.

The vessel's engine had failed and the fishermen did not have any food. A helicopter delivered food to them and a team of Navy sailors returned Wednesday morning and fixed the trawler.

The USS Elrod is part of a naval interception force supporting the trade sanctions imposed on Iraq by the United Nations after Saddam Hussein's forces invaded Kuwait in August 1990.

Gunmen kill candidate's bodyguard

MANAGUA, Nicaragua — Gunmen shot at leading presidential candidate Arnaldo Aleman on the campaign trail Thursday, missing him but killing a bodyguard.

Three other people were wounded in the assassination attempt, which took place about 10 a.m. in the mountain community of Quilali, 85 miles north of the capital, Managua, Radio Corporacion said.

President offers vote on drug scandal



BOGOTA, Colombia — Saying it would be "an act of cowardice" to resign, President Ernesto Samper suggested holding a referendum to decide whether he should leave office over charges he accepted drug money during his campaign.

In a televised address Wednesday, Samper said stepping down would promote a "dangerous situation" and a vote would let the nation decide his fate.

"Colombians have the right, and above all the obligation, to participate in the solution to this problem," Samper said.

Samper's support has eroded rapidly since the president was aware the Cali drug cartel funded his 1994 election bid with millions of dollars.

Police chief denies threat to opposition

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — Haiti's new police chief Thursday brushed aside allegations he plotted to assassinate legislators who are battling his appointment.

"It's a political game," Jean-Marie Fourle Celestin told The Associated Press.

But Celestin refused to respond directly to the charges that Sen. Jean-Robert Sabatal made Wednesday in the Senate, saying, "I don't want to descend to his level."

Sabatal told fellow senators he had received a letter from a Cabinet minister accusing Celestin of plotting to kill several legislators. He refused to identify the Cabinet minister.

Russian officers steal rocket fuel

MOSCOW — Military officers at the Plesetsk cosmodrome in northern Russia have been systematically selling rocket fuel and pocketing the money, officials said Thursday.

The officers, led by the head of the launching site's fuel supply service, have sold some \$1.5 million in fuel over the past five years, the military prosecutor's office told the IJAR-Tass news agency.

The report said the fuel was sold to unspecified commercial firms and "unscrupulous businessmen."

The report cited other examples of theft throughout the Russian military.

One army colonel sold two helicopter engines to a private business, and a group of senior officers with Moscow Air Defense have been "systematically transferring extra money to commercial companies' accounts," the prosecutors said.



Pullman, Moscow hospitals drop talks

MOSCOW — A plan to merge the hospitals in Pullman, Wash., and Moscow is dead.
Blaming misunderstandings, high emotions and Washington State University opposition, officials at Pullman Memorial Hospital and Grigman Medical Center announced on Wednesday that plans for joint governance have been terminated.
The merger plan, already troubled by discontent in Pullman and the Pullman Memorial Hospital Foundation Board, was unable to recover when Washington State officials also began questioning it, hospital officials said.
"We haven't given up on the idea completely, but for now we are no longer pursuing the matter," Grigman administrator Robert Colvin said. "The Moscow community and University of Idaho seemed to have a high level of acceptance, but we didn't get the same perception from Pullman and WSU, and that along with the politics and pressures we encountered was a serious concern."

Cost of building dikes stops excavation

GRANGEVILLE — The mammoth fossil excavation at Tolo Lake will not continue next summer because of the cost of building dikes around the work site.
Robert Yoder of the Idaho State Historical Society said it would cost between \$200,000 and \$400,000 to build the dikes to keep water from filling in three excavation sites developed over the last two years.
Yoder said David LeBar, an engineer with the Idaho Department of Water Resources, evaluated the Tolo Lake site and came up with the cost estimate.
"But, he said, 'We can't come up with that amount of money.'"
The dikes were part of a compromise between people who wish to see the mammoth dig continue and the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, which intends to develop the lake into a fishery.

Hydroplane revival request withdrawn

COEUR D'ALENE — Backers of a plan to bring back hydroplane racing on Lake Coeur d'Alene have announced they will withdraw their request for permission to revive the Diamond Cup unlimited hydroplane race.
Although confident of majority support on the Coeur d'Alene City Council and in the community, the Diamond Cup Association feared litigation by opponents would slow the process to meet a February deadline.
"We've got quite a lot of information that the first thing the opposition would do is throw up a legal tactic to force the City Council to put it on a referendum," said Diamond Cup Association President John McGruder.

Legislators push for federal money for miner

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Sen. Larry Craig and Congressman Michael Crapo are pushing to get \$87,674 in taxpayer money for a gold miner who has fought the Forest Service and environmentalists for more than a decade.
The miner, Matt Clawson of Pocatello, says he has been broken financially by the long fight over his stream-side project outside Challis, near the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness. But Clawson is a small-stakes campaign contributor to Crapo and environmentalists are accusing Crapo and fellow Republican Craig of pushing special-interest legislation.
"It's atrocious," said Gerald Jayne of Idaho Falls, a member of the Idaho Environmental Council, a group that sued in 1984 to block Clawson's mine. "He was in violation of the law, he lost in court, and now he's trying to get money from the federal government." Crapo and Craig have introduced identical "private relief" bills, rare legislation aimed at remedying individual grievances. They call for Clawson to receive a \$87,674 federal payout.
Clawson filed claims in 1981 on 20 acres of Forest Service land about 30 miles northwest of Challis for a stream-side gold mine. The Forest Service approved the project in July 1984 and Clawson began work on the site.

labor at his mine. Crapo followed suit last September. No action has been taken on either bill, but Clawson said he has been pleased with the response from Craig and Crapo.
"They've been really good," he said. "They've got no reason to do it other than they think it's the right thing to do, because I've got no money."
Clawson, 53, says he lost \$250,000 during the dispute, and now is deep in debt. But he gave Crapo \$82 during his 1994 re-election campaign and said he

might donate to Craig's re-election campaign this year.
Crapo spokeswoman Susan Wheeler denied a link between Clawson's contribution and the Crapo bill. Until Crapo checked last week with his campaign finance records in response to an inquiry, he was unaware Clawson was a campaign supporter, Wheeler said.
Craig said he did not believe Clawson had ever given him campaign money, and that he has worked on the case because it deserves attention.

Artist McClusky considers fairies, angels — and Santa

TWIN FALLS — Tinker Bell would be proud. In Sue McClusky's workshop, there is pixie dust everywhere.

It goes with the magical, fairy-tale feeling — and with McClusky's medieval friends, propped on their stands looking ready to flutter away at any given moment.

McClusky sculpts fairies, angels and Santas.

"I can work on them, but they develop their own personalities," said the artist, whose background is in English, not art. "I feel like I am writing a story with them. It's almost eerie."

Those who have purchased McClusky's creations at church

bazaars or craft fairs have told her they feel it, too.

"One writer said it (an angel) was her muse," McClusky explained. "Another woman had surgery, and her angel sat by her and made everything feel OK."

Angels are hot items right now, and McClusky takes her angels very seriously.

"I really believe in guardian angels," she said. "I think we should have a healthy respect for our guardian angels."

McClusky has recently crafted a series of "ABC angels." Each comes holding a hand-painted ABC storybook ("D is for dad ..."). Most of McClusky's creations are also named and numbered.

There is Lysistrata and Lady Bertram and Miriam, who is draped in mounds and mounds of gold fabric.

McClusky said her artwork grew out of her childhood, when her father read fairy tales to her. But she didn't begin to create her own fairy-tale characters until about eight years ago.

She started with a stick, a wire and a berry — and ended up with a "berry fairy."

Once an English teacher, McClusky was soon collecting names for her fairies from the pages of some of her favorite literary classics.

Today, she has a studio in her garage, where she drills and pounds. She dresses her creations in the plush velvets, rich brocades and colorful ribbons that she collects wherever she goes.

Japan's 'Picture Bride' is on Foreign Film list

In the modern book of love — as grotesquely simplified by Hollywood movies — boy meets girl, boy courts girl, boy marries girl. In "Picture Bride," Kayo Hata's romance about Japanese laborers in 1918 Hawaii who acquire spouses through mail order, girl marries man, girl and man grow relationship, woman and man see love bloom. It is a lovely and rare specimen.

The Hollywood convention, by way of Shakespeare comedy, is to view marriage as a resolution of all conflicts. Both pragmatically and lyrically, "Picture Bride" regards marriage as the beginning of a lifelong negotiation that leads to respect and, in turn, to love.

In other ways, too, "Picture Bride" defies Hollywood convention. It is deliberately not constructed like a domino setup, a curving row where the eye is drawn to the action of tiles falling. "Picture Bride" is your bead-on-a-string narrative: Each episode is well-wrought, but the viewer must reflect upon how they all add up. In that it deals with a mail-order bride (an arrangement that was an extension of the Japanese tradition of arranged marriage) in a land that is both harsh and lush, "Picture Bride" may remind some of "The Piano."

Hata's movie is the story of Riyo (Yuki Kudo), a teen-age city girl who travels to Hawaii in the belief that her groom is a

young and prosperous sugar-cane farmer, Matsuji (Akira Takayama). He sends her his picture and a haiku that makes her heart flutter. But when Riyo arrives in Honolulu, her heart stops: Matsuji is forthright, a share-cropper toiling under hellish conditions in this tropical paradise.

How, Riyo wonders, can she have a relationship with someone who misrepresents himself? How, Matsuji worries, can this frail city creature work in the fields and be his helpmeet? While Riyo remains aloof to her betrothed, she sees him lavishly tenderness on his garden and orchids. While Matsuji holds himself back from intimacy, he sees Riyo develop an entrepreneurial spirit under the tutelage of another picture bride, Kana (Tamlyn Tomita).

And they share the occasional glances into Oahu's edenic North Shore. In one of the film's many memorable episodes, they go to the silent movies - projected onto a sheet rigged up in the canopy - where the benshi, or narrator, is played by legendary Japanese actor Toshiro Mifune. The appearance of this gruff

action hero in Hatta's gentle romance is an unexpected pleasure with great symbolic import. Mifune is like a godfather giving his benediction to Riyo and Matsui, but he is also the embodiment of the male principle who doesn't lead, rather follows. "Picture Bride's" feminine rhythms.

McClusky works with whatever tools she can find ("sometimes I use Dave's old medical tools"), and she uses a lot of silver and embroidery thread. She always cups her figures' hands a little, so they can be held, and she weaves her angels' hair and builds individual stands for them. The angels' faces are tiny, but these celestial beings stand tall in their flowing gowns.

McClusky doesn't know how long it takes to make an angel, she said, though she knows it takes a very long time to make an angel's wing.

"But I have a constant feeling of usefulness and goodness while I'm doing them," she explained.

McClusky's creations are one of a kind.

"I've tried, but I can't make two alike," she said. "I have a room full of stuff and, sometimes, certain pieces just seem to want to go together."

McClusky is not about to meddle in the process.

"I was at Morningside School reading fairy stories to the children the other day, and I took along my fairy dust and showed them how to make fairies," she said. "They understood all of this perfectly."

Then she added, with a smile, "I told them don't ever grow up and lose that."

Rain: Meet the Beatles in Jackpot Steppin' out

JACKPOT - It's not easy living a legend.

But Rain: A Tribute to the Beatles has been doing this, to rave reviews, for the past 20 years.

It's been 30 years since the Fab Four arrived in the United States, made that monumental appearance on the "Ed Sullivan Show" and went on to change the course of modern pop music. During the '60s, a typical Beatles concert lasted only 20 minutes - and included no material from some of the group's greatest albums. Rain decided to try and fill the void.

Rain started out as Reign in 1975. Like many others bands on the L.A. scene, the group's main objective was to record original tunes. Eventually, the group became even more interested in duplicating the sound of the Beatles. The present band members have been together since 1983.

"These are the best musicians, singers and performers you could hope for," said Mark Lewis, keyboard player and founding member of Rain. "Our shows change every time and include almost every Beatles song."

Book the act for 12 shows, and you get 12 different shows.

Rain's approach to the Beatles music is to treat the tunes with the same respect that a classical musician has for a classical piece. The musicians do not merely learn a

song, they study it. Every vocal part, every chord inversion has to be there. It pays off.

"This group has had national and international exposure, particularly through movie soundtracks," Lewis said.

Rain performed the entire soundtrack to Dick Clark's film "The Beatlemania." And, in 1980, the group joined forces with stars of the hit Broadway show "Beatlemania."

Ten years later, Rain, in conjunction with BeatExpo, climbed on top of a roof in Seattle and, in front of live cameras, duplicated the last public performance of the Beatles - the Apple Corps Ltd. building rooftop concert documented in the film "Let It Be." At this concert, Rain performed every song the Beatles did, in the original order, note for note. The event became the focus of pieces on CNN-TV and in USA Today.

When asked whether the group members have trouble maintaining their own identities, Lewis said they are only playing a role.

"On stage, it is admiration for the characters you are portraying," he said. "When you leave the stage, the characters leave the stage with you."

Rain band members range in age from mid-30s to early 40s. Most reside in Reno, Nev., though some live in California. The guys have families, and they pride themselves on presenting a family show.

Lewis is actually the fifth member of the group, and he's there to complete the sound.

During the recording days of the Beatles, the group would often use strings, horns, additional keyboards or an entire orchestra. Using the variety of sounds that can be reproduced electronically these days, Lewis' job is to make sure the band can perform any of the songs live.

DEAR ABBY: I have read your column for years. I'm often surprised, moved, outraged or entertained by the foibles of those who write to you. You answer each letter with such courtesy, kindness and wisdom that I often wonder how you can be so objective and nonjudgmental.

Take, for instance, "Stressed at Home in Pa.," the mother of four children - all under the age of 5 - who needed a "sanity day." Abby, why did she have four children under the age of 5? Hasn't she heard of cause and effect? Whether it's because of religious, social, ethnic or family traditions, too many couples (and single women) make decisions that create heavy burdens they end up carrying far longer than nine months.

We no longer live in a world where the support mechanisms necessary for the successful rearing of large families exist for low- and middle-income families. If they had been available to "Stressed," she would have been receiving her sanity day from her church, or from the children's grandparents, or even from the sisters who remember the "fun and funny" sibling who is now stressed.

Parents today (if children are fortunate enough to have two) must make conscious choices between quantity or quality. Fewer children means more time for Mom to enjoy the few that she does have, more time with hubby doing the fun things that brought them together, more time to volunteer to help children less fortunate than her own, and more time to grow spiritually and mentally so she can guide her fewer children toward paths that will enrich the world.

Decisions must be made with awareness of the realities that exist today. Children should be taught the concept of cause and effect. As a society, we can no longer afford to act without considering the consequences and then complain about the responsibilities we must shoulder. Without a long-term perspective, we will continue to have rampant divorce, welfare mothers, gender conflict and escalating crime thanks to children who grow up in combat zones.

Before we accept the responsibility of bringing more children into this world, we should stop and smell the dippers.

Backbeat

The British are coming!

But no one in U.S. really cares

When the British band Oasis released its debut album in 1994, it sold more copies in its first week than any other record in British music history. Earlier this year, initial sales of the band's second album topped the first.

Together with its archival, a band called Blur, Oasis has spearheaded a revival of British pop music in the United Kingdom so vibrant and commercially successful that it has been called "Britpop."

But more than a year after Oasis' "Definitely, Maybe" on the Epic label arrived in American music stores, it has sold a measly 358,000 copies, according to Soundscan, a company that monitors sales of music in the United States.



The British pop band Oasis has met with a lukewarm response in America - quite a shock after taking the United Kingdom by storm.

How about nine inch nails? "I doubt it." People," which lampooned wealthy upper-class freshmen girls who satisfy their curiosity by briefly dating working-class boys, American students can be forgiven for scratching their heads and yawning at the class tiffs of the Brits.

There are some exceptions to the rule of failure for young British musicians in the United States, but they tend to prove the rule.

The solo singer Seal has had huge success with his second album this year and has become the first British act to reach No. 1 on the Billboard singles chart two years in a row with "Kiss From a Rose." But, unlike the heavily accented singing typical of Britpop, there is nothing identifiably British about his middle-of-the-road crooning.

Then there's the wildly successful band Bush, which sounds like the band members learned every trick they know in the grunge clubs of early '90s Seattle. They're almost unknown in their native England.

What Bush has done that many Britpop bands seem unprepared to do is put in the time, touring all the out-of-the-way towns in the States. That also may partly explain why Oasis is the modest leader of the Britpop bunch.

Samantha Sayer, a New York University film student who founded Massive, a promotions company dedicated to breaking the sound barrier for British bands in America, runs a Britpop club once a week at Babyland, a Manhattan bar. She also publishes a Britpop fanzine called "Kill Pearl Jam Dead" and heads the U.S. fan club for the U.K. band Suede.

"In America, styles obviously change a lot more slowly (than they do in Britain)," Sayer said. "But I don't think these bands are going to have to change. I think it's just going to take some time."

Listeners to some U.S. radio stations are more likely to hear Duran Duran on a lunchtime '80s revival show than anything by "Supergrass," "Menswear" or "Echobelly" - all hot new bands in Britain.

"We are attempting to play some of the more popular stuff, like the new songs from Oasis and Blur," said Dan Zako, general manager and vice president of WDRE-FM in New York, which pays careful attention to what listeners say they like. "But if people don't want to hear it ... after a while what can you do?"

The music that has young Americans reaching to change the dial on their radios is mainly a guitar-based sound that avoids the power chords of grunge, opting instead for melody, harmony, emotive energy and, almost without exception, a dismissive, ironic wit often based on pop-culture British subject matter.

So why millions of present or past British college students won't be amused by the truism of Pulp's song "Common

Many other British bands wouldn't sniff at those figures. In spite of its minimal sales, Oasis is still, relatively, one of the most successful new British acts in the American market.

The situation is mirrored on the other side of the ocean: Pearl Jam is a memory to record buyers, and Hootie and the Blowfish get turned down for musical slots on daytime talk shows.

Fans like these mark a trend that's about more than mere figures. It used to be in the '60s, '70s and '80s that Britain and the States - allied by a sort of common language, musically and otherwise - made up a mutual admiration society.

The Rolling Stones, the Beatles, The Who and Duran Duran refueled their conquests of America; in the United Kingdom, American acts such as Jimi Hendrix, Janis Joplin and Bob Dylan were received with great affection and sold millions of records. Hendrix made some of his best recordings for the BBC, and he and Dylan attracted hundreds of thousands of British youngsters when they played the Isle of Wight festival.

But now, for the first time since the Beatles arrived, British pop music is irrelevant in America.

"I can't remember a time when British and American music seemed this much apart," said Fred Bronson, who writes about the charts for Billboard magazine and who spent six months in London last year.

In the United Kingdom, American bands have little currency. Earlier this year, James Strong, a producer for a popular British prime TV show, received a call from a publicist for Hootie. Would he like to have the hottest band in America on the show?

"I'd heard of them, but no one's very interested," said Strong, who regularly shows top bands on his program. Asked if he would book Green Day, he said, "Who? Never heard of them."

Chang eliminates Agassi

MELBOURNE, Australia — Defending champion Andre Agassi ran out of miracles at last on Friday when human backboard Michael Chang overcame a rib injury to reach the Australian Open final.

The top-ranked Agassi, who clawed from behind in four matches and won three five-setters, played indifferently as a nearly flawless Chang beat him for the first time in a Grand Slam event, 6-1, 6-4, 7-5 (7-1).

Chang, who will be seeking his first Grand Slam championship since he won the French Open at 17 in 1989, will play the winner of the other semifinal between Boris Becker and Mark Woodford.

—Agassi, who had won 12 consecutive matches over two years at the Australian, left the tournament with the No. 1 ranking but without the prize he wanted most — another Grand Slam title.

“If you’re No. 1 in the world, it doesn’t mean that you’re safe anymore,” said Chang.

the No. 5 seed. “Obviously you have to be out there playing your best tennis.”

Agassi obviously wasn’t. He said he decided to “go for the miracle” in coming back from two sets down against Jim Courier in the quarters, but made little effort to do that same against Chang.

Though Agassi had beaten Chang in nine of their past 13 matches, and in all three of their Grand Slam matches, there was little surprise in Chang’s victory this time after they way they had been playing over the past two weeks.

Agassi came in following a 3½-month lay-off due to a chest muscle injury. Chang came in healthy, winning a tuneup exhibition the week before the Australian Open.

“I felt rather flat,” Agassi said. “I’ve played a lot of sets. To play against the left, against a guy like Michael that’s going to move you from corner to corner, I took a lot of chances. I just didn’t have it. In the end, the person with the better footwork has the advantage.”

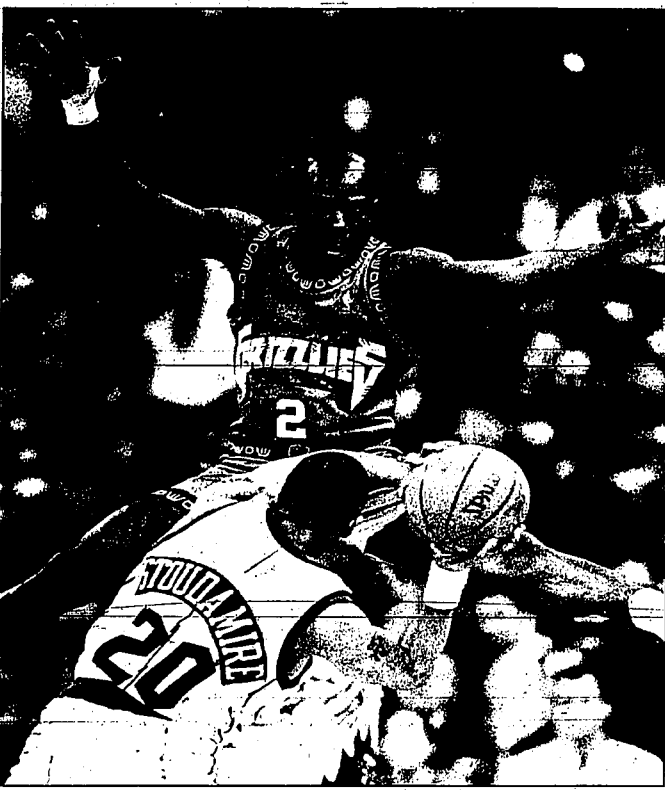

Former Super Bowl QB lives on street

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Joe Gilliam plans to watch his old team, the Pittsburgh Steelers, in the Super Bowl.

Where he'll watch, Gilliam doesn't know. He doesn't know where he'll sleep that night, either.

Jefferson Street Joe, who won two Super Bowl rings with the Steelers in the 1970s, is living on the streets of his hometown. He's been fighting drug addiction for over two decades now.

The fact that he will watch the Steelers' try for their fifth championship is about the only sure thing Gilliam knows right now.

"I take one day at a time, you know. A couple of days, that's too far down the line at this point," Gilliam said last week at a restaurant in his old neighborhood.

He said he hasn't used heroin, a drug he began taking in late 1975, in over five years. Now he smokes some crack, but said only God can help him stop.

"I'm not really as bad as I seem," Gilliam told The Tennessean. "I'll be over the hump. I can take it or leave it."

Gilliam has mixed stints as a drug-rehabilitation counselor between a string of arrests on charges ranging from possessing drugs to weapons to a 1991 armed robbery of a Louisiana restaurant.

Slipping back to drugs is too easy for an addict, Gilliam said, no matter what kind of support comes from friends and family.

"I stopped doing the things that I was supposed to be doing, the things that helped me with my sobriety," he said. "Almost everybody who's had a relapse has stopped doing something he should've been doing to help maintain his sobriety. That's exactly what happened."

Gilliam's place in NFL history is solid enough.

Picked in the 11th round by the Steelers in 1972, Gilliam became the first black quarterback to start a regular-season game when he led Pittsburgh over Baltimore 30-0 in the 1974 opener.

He got his chance when Terry Bradshaw refused to cross the picket line that summer during players' strike. Gilliam said coach Chuck Noll promised him a shot at the starting job if he crossed the line.

But he lost his spot despite a 4-1-1 start and a three-game winning streak. Gilliam said he thinks race, hate mail

Gilliam lasted a short time before being dismissed for breaking team rules.

Hometown headlines chronicled his attempts at semi-pro ball and the USFL. Also noted were numerous arrests, repeated trips to drug-rehabilitation units and his work as a rehabilitation counselor.

In the late 1970s, he hocked his Super Bowl rings to buy drugs. An ABC report during the 1988 Super Bowl resulted in a group of businessmen buying back one ring for Gilliam.

He now has both rings, but they are at his parents' home for safekeeping.

Good nights come when Gilliam, now 37, has enough money to stay in a rooming-house. Other times, he sleeps where he can.

He's in frequent contact with his family, who have repeatedly tried to help him. His older brother Craig even gave him a job as his offensive coordinator in 1993 at Lane College, a Division II school in west Tennessee. Gilliam passed his drug tests but stayed only one year.

Craig Gilliam wishes people would

quit dredging up his brother's story. "All they are doing is capitalizing on that hype, that's all."

New everybody is writing about him. Why not last year? What about 19 years ago? It's a bunch of hogwash," Craig Gilliam said.

The Steelers' return to the Super Bowl has put the former quarterback back in the spotlight here. Everyone wants to talk football, who he thinks will win, and how he's faring.

Wearing a new warm-up suit, sneakers and black baseball cap, Joe Gilliam said he had hopes for the future.

He has talked with his father, former college coach Joe Gilliam Sr., about a football camp for juvenile and adult offenders looking to learn a skill and how to cope with life after jail. He's also looking for a job.

Gilliam doesn't worry about what might have been and the mistakes he's made in life.

"Other people do it for me, you know what I mean ... and I just refuse to look at it that way. I'd never be able to get up, you know? I couldn't go on. If happened, I let it go," Gilliam said.

Versatile Stewart, Sanders promise unique matchup

The mismatch, a recurrent Super Bowl theme, carries extra significance this year with the presence of the Steelers' Kordell Stewart and the Cowboys' Deion Sanders.

While the NFL's dominance over the AFC represents a familiar kind of mismatch, the versatility of Stewart and Sanders presents new challenges for both teams. Both players have the ability to offer what every offense craves and every defense dreads — the man-to-man mismatch.

Matchups are football's foundation. It's why teams substitute on nearly every play.

What Stewart gives the Steelers as a quarterback/receiver/running back, the Cowboys figure they can match with Sanders as a cornerback/kick returner/receiver. Stewart has yet to play both ways, so give Sanders and the Cowboys the edge in the matchup between unusual players. If they desire, the Cowboys could easily erase Stewart's threat by simply assigning Sanders to him.

Because that is impractical, the Sanders-Stewart factor becomes the most intriguing aspect of a Super Bowl buildup that usually gets nothing fiercer. "With two weeks to get everything in, I can see Stewart and Sanders being involved in some special plays," said Tony Dungy, Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator.

So provocative are the possibilities that players like Nebraska quarterback Tommie Frazier may get extra attention as a quarterback/running back in this year's draft. "The problem is there aren't a lot of guys who are that good," Washington Redskins general manager Charley Cassady said. "A lot of quarterbacks who fit that mold usually can't run. They run 4.8 (40-yard dashes), not 4.5 or 4.6. Doug Flutie couldn't play another position."

Sanders caught one pass for 35 yards against the Green Bay Packers in the NFC championship game, but he also returned punts. The two-way duty was part of the \$13 million deal he signed with the Cowboys this year. It helps make up for his half-time football season while he finishes baseball. Can Kordell Stewart hit home runs? Has he played in a World Series?

Cowboys receiver Michael Irvin kids that Sanders draws up plays on note paper and slips them under the doors of coaches on game-plan days in hopes of becoming a more vital part of the offense.

Cowboys coach Barry Switzer said if they could persuade Sanders to give up baseball and report to training camp so he could run routes with quarterback Troy Aikman, he could

become "one of the greatest wide receivers in history."

While his speed forces defenses to beware, the Packers covered him with nickel back Lenny McMillin much of the time, figuring the experience of an average defender would offset Sanders' inexperience. It proved true on one deep route when Sanders got too close to the sideline and was forced out of bounds so he became an ineligible receiver. He unsuccessfully lobbied for an interference penalty.

Likewise, Stewart got away with running out of the end zone for two steps before catching a touchdown pass that helped eliminate the Indianapolis Colts in the AFC game.

Defensive coordinator Wade Phillips of the Buffalo Bills, who lost the Steelers in the second round of the playoffs, said Stewart as quarterback offers problems that Sanders as receiver can't.

"You know when you say you don't worry about the second quarterback because they run the same offense? When this guy goes in, they run a different offense. You have to work on two offenses," Phillips said. With Sanders at receiver, the Cowboys run the same offense. The main difference is the danger in the end zone.

The ultimate advantage of versatility, of course, is how a player affects the salary cap. Anybody who can line up at more than one position relieves the pressure on general managers trying to field teams under a cap. collectors and seminars. "The problem is that it's even an occasional bad apple... Haug said, "There are bad apples in most of these industries."

But critics say this industry has more than most. "There are many debt collectors who are very conscientious and follow the strict letter of the law, but there are many, many, many debt collectors who try to get away with a lot more than the law allows and some who just blatantly violate it without caring," Leonard said.

They don't have a lot of incentive necessarily not to break the law. There are so many little collection agencies that come and go. Their employees work on quotas. They're not highly paid and not overly educated and the turnover is high.

The Federal Trade Commission, the main government agency that polices violators of the law, reported to Congress several months ago that it continues to investigate many consumer complaints of abuses by collectors, including: obscene language, racial and ethnic slurs; harassing phone calls at work; and false threats for nonpayment.

Doover, down on his luck and the target of a collection agency during the '80s, said he has experienced some of these abuses firsthand. "I was contacted by a collector for a major credit card company who was going to be indicted for fraud and do time in jail," he said. "At one point the debt collector told me I was worth more dead than alive."

ANSWER: Three diamonds. With good cards in opener's suit, the hand is worth another bid.

If you're not familiar with today's trump suit combination, study it carefully. You're bound to be confronted with it someday and you rate to profit from the lesson.
 West takes his top spades and shifts to a club. Where should South win this trick and how should he attack in trumps?
 Having lost two spade tricks, South must find the best way to avoid losing two trump tricks. If he wins the club shift in hand and plays ace and another trump, he relinquishes any shot at taking only one trump trick. There are no combinations paying off to that weak effort.
 If he wins in dummy to lead the trump jack, this will work only if East is foolish enough to cover. When he doesn't, South must lose to the queen and king and goes one down.
 The only legitimate play for the game is to find the non-10 doubleton or 10-x in the West hand. Against either holding, South starts with a low trump toward dummy's jack. If West grabs his queen, South leads the trump jack from dummy by itself against East's king while blotting West's 10. (East must have something for his raise.)
 If West bravely plays the 10 on the low trump lead to dummy, South must cover with dummy's jack and then play his ace on the next round. If the trump 10 were a true singleton, there is no way to avoid two trump losers and South must hope the ace will drop the remaining trump honor.

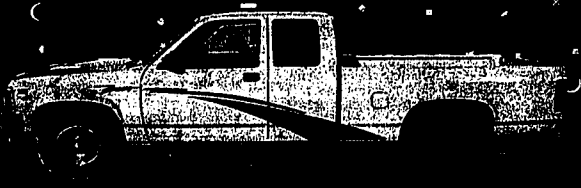

Williams uses his experience to create CBS' 'Matt Waters'

Talk show host Montel Williams' background is very close to that of the character he portrays in CBS' "Matt Waters."

"It would be a coincidence if somebody else came up with (the idea for the show) and asked me to do it," Williams comments. "But the concept behind 'Matt Waters,' which airs Wednesdays, was Williams' idea.

"The talk-show host, who gave up his naval commission to be a motivational speaker in high schools, stars as Matt Waters, a 20-year Navy SEAL veteran. After his brother is killed in a drive-by shooting, Matt retires from the Navy. He returns to his old high school as a science teacher, in hopes of making a difference in some of his students' lives.

"I thought it was a good way to take a look at a person who has a conservative

point of view, and put him in a situation where he, too, has to learn some things," Williams explains. "This is (about) an education not only from the standpoint of having me play a character who teaches kids lessons and things, but he learns some things, too. This is a guy with a 20-year military background and he's in the middle of a high school with a whole different set of perspectives that he would have ever had growing up."

"The concept of the show is an idea Williams has been developing for more than four years.

"I was a motivational speaker for several years and I traveled to ... high schools all over this nation," Williams says. "This whole character and the idea about this was something I had been working on conceptually for quite a while.

"Then I was able to pitch it and the pitch worked well and we've kind of refined it along the way in the last

four years to get it to the point where it is today."

"What Williams learned from his experience as a speaker has gradually developed into issues the students on the show face.

"We deal with spousal abuse and domestic abuse," he says. "One of our characters lives in a home where he has an abusive father. So we're dealing with that and we're dealing with teen pregnancy. We have a young lady who abandons her child and the kids try to find her.

"We're also dealing with issues like drive-by shootings and violence and how kids respond and act with violence."

Williams worked hard to create Matt Waters.

"That part has kind of come as a compilation of my motivational speaking, being in the schools and interacting with kids and then also working very hard with an acting coach to make sure that I'm not (The) Montel Williams (Show)

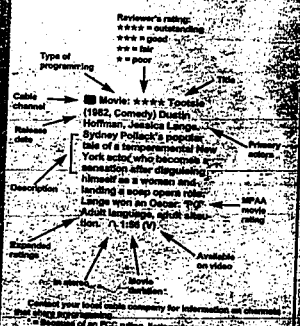

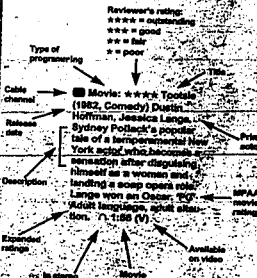

Lewis' closing line to his former showbiz partner: "Rest well, and don't forget to meet me when I get there."

Q: In "Georgia," were Jennifer Jason Leigh and Marc Winningham's voices dubbed? — O.C.

A: Leigh, 33, and Winningham, 36, and multi-talented Leigh, who can carry off tunes as well as their convincing screen roles as singing sisters caught in an intense rivalry. Winningham wrote "If I Wanted," which she performed in the film. She's winning raves for her role as Georgia, a successful folk singer. Leigh, as Sophie, a failed rock singer battling the bottle, belts out numbers like "I see you and I sure could nab an Oscar nomination for Best Actress."

Q: As an old, old fan of Bill Cosby's, I'd like to

meet him sometime. Does he hang out at a favorite bar or restaurant? If so, could you tall me which one? — R.E.

A: Cosby, 58, is one of the few entertainers who doesn't much care for the celebrity thing. In fact, in interviews, he often talks about the "Bill Cosby character," as though he's a separate person. It seems that he needs to distance himself from the Cosby the public loves.

As for spotting him in the flesh, check out antique stores that specialize in old fountain pens, or try auctions where pens are for sale. Cosby has quite a valuable collection of these writing instruments.

Q: When will Kitty Kelley's new book on the Duke of Edinburgh be published? I thought the books on Frank Sinatra and Nancy Reagan were both juicy and fascinating. — V.R.

A: Kelley, 53, is hard at work, but she's bumped into a few stone walls. She has a lot of material on the duke's many gossiped-about peccadilloes, but she wants documentation on the matter, and she can't find it.

However, the royals have paid off many of those associated with the queen's husband, and

they're not willing to jeopardize their pensions by substantiating what Kelley has uncovered. The Rockefeller and the Kennedys have used this kind of inestimable bribery as a public relations tool as well, as nothing buys silence as effectively.

Q: Now that he's been in "Casino," will Alan King be featured in other films? — T.R.

A: King, who plays a "heavy" in the thriller "Casino," is extremely excited about his latest project, but it's not a movie. He has a tell-all book coming out on Father's Day, titled "Name Droppings: The Life and Lives of Alan King" (Scribner's).

King, 66, reveals never-before-told tales about everybody who was anybody in show business over the past 50 years, including Charlie Chaplin, Frank Sinatra, Judy Garland and his "Casino" costars, Robert De Niro and Sharon Stone.

Q: Bruce Willis is one of my favorite action film stars. Do you know if he does his own stunts on screen, or does he use a stunt double? — M.G.

A: Bruce Willis, 40, is one of the most fearless film stars on the silver

screen. Braver than ever with Brad Pitt in the bizarre, futuristic fantasy "12 Monkeys," Bruce loves doing his own stunts.

"If I didn't get injured at least once a week, it wasn't a good week," Willis jokes. "But accidents do happen — and there are some stunts that, in retrospect, I probably shouldn't have done."

"When I was little," Willis recalls, "I played army games all the time, rolling around, jumping off trees. And sometimes, I still think I'm a little kid, still think I can do things I probably shouldn't."

Q: Fran Drescher may have the voice of your mother, but "The Nanny" TV star has the toughest figure of a sexy high-school cheerleader. How does she keep in such great shape? — D.G.

A: Fran says she doesn't go in for the kind of heavy aerobic workouts that many female stars endure these days in Hollywood. But she is careful about what she eats (no dairy products, she says), and uses her leisure time wisely.

With a hit TV show, a Francis Ford Coppola movie ("Jack," with Robin-Williams and Bill

Cosby), pantyhose advertisements and a book all cooking simultaneously, Drescher says she just doesn't have the time to head to the gym all that often. She's a big isometric exercise fan, however. For example, when she goes to the movies, she works out while watching the screen.

"I'm squeezing my butt while other people are feeding their faces," she quips. Drescher, 38, has been married to producer-writer Peter Marc Jacobson for 17 years, and is a faithful wife, she points out. Nonetheless, she likes the idea that other men enjoy looking at her. And that they most assuredly do.

Q: I heard that Gerard Depardieu has dropped a lot of weight from his portly French frame. Any idea how much? — E.C.

A: Depardieu, 37, is the latest film star to jump on the fitness wagon. He's shed nearly 50 pounds, following a rigorous routine of diet and exercise. —

plus giving up his beloved French wine.

Q: I know that Eddie Fisher's wife, Betty Lin, has been managing his career. Is she still? — O.L.

A: Betty Lin, who managed the career of her husband for a long time — even before they were married in 1953 — has officially wiped her hands of his business affairs. It seems she's too busy with her restaurants and clubs and doesn't have time for Eddie's engagements, which keep him quite busy.

Last October, Fisher, 67, spent some time sequestered in a Las Vegas hotel preparing for a recording session — his first in 26 years — with the London Philharmonic Orchestra. The resulting CD features renditions of Irving Berlin, Cole Porter and Richard Rogers classics. His daughter Tricia Leigh — from his marriage to Connie Stevens — joins him for a duet of one of his biggest hits, "Oh! My Papa."

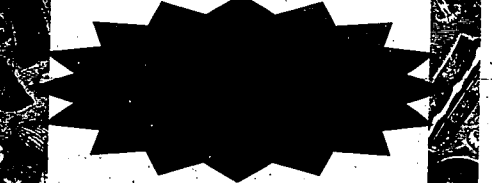

Change at the top of ABC's 'World News Tonight'

NEW YORK (AP) — Kathryn Christensen was named executive producer Thursday of ABC's "World News Tonight," the nation's most-watched evening newscast.

She becomes only the second woman to head a major network's flagship newscast.

Christensen, a senior producer since 1993,

succeeds Rick Kaplan, who after two years in the job has been named executive producer of special projects for the ABC network.

Christensen, who a year ago took on added duties as executive producer of "World News Saturday/Sunday," joined ABC News in 1990 as a senior producer after

a decade at The Wall Street Journal. From 1991 to 1993 she was managing editor of the Baltimore Sun.

The first woman to head a major network's flagship newscast was Emily Rooney, who preceded Kaplan at "World News Tonight" and now heads political coverage for Fox News.

Kaplan, a 17-year veteran of ABC News,

became executive producer of "World News Tonight" in 1994. Before that, he held similar positions at "PrimeTime Live" and "Nightline."

In his newly created job, he will create and produce special programming for all of the network's divisions, including news, entertainment and sports.

Cavett closes CNBC show

NEW YORK (AP) — Dick Cavett has opted out of his talk show on cable TV's CNBC.

Cavett, 59, did not elaborate on his decision against renewing the 6-year-old talk show, and made no public statement Wednesday, according to his publicist, Glenn Schwartz.

"The Dick Cavett Show" has been one of the network's signature programs, said CNBC Senior Vice President Chet Collier. "We will miss the wit, intelligence and thoughtfulness that Dick Cavett has brought to our prime-time talk lineup and we wish him in his new endeavors."

Cavett, a "Tonight" show writer-turned-standup comedian, got his first talk show on ABC's daytime schedule in 1968. In late '69, ABC gave him a late-night show, opposite NBC's "Tonight," which ran until 1975.

From 1977 to 1982, "The Dick Cavett Show" aired five times a week on public television.

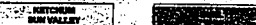

Network executive blues

PASADENA, Calif. — The view from the top in network television can make you dizzy. Take it from the people who have to deal with the big-picture issues at the Big Four: ABC, NBC, CBS and Fox. It's hard enough being in a job where, as a broadcaster, you're supposed to please most of all of the people most all of the time. But during this season, which has failed to turn up hit, it seems harder than ever.

With television's ever-shifting competitive landscape, corporate megamergers and mounting political pressures, if your dream is to grow up and become a network president, you may want to reconsider.

Take Leslie Moonves. He's been president of third-place CBS Entertainment for less than a year, arriving last summer just as the season was getting under way and inheriting a prime-time schedule of shows that failed in so many ways it's hard to know where to start. Everyone knows where CBS ended up, of course. In the ratings cellar.

"Every day that number would come in ... I'd hate it. I'd hate it," Moonves told critics at the January Press Tour. "There have been many times during the six months that I said to myself, 'What was I thinking when I took this job?'"

Moonves admitted that CBS' attempt to reinvent itself, trying to attract a

younger, "Fox-ier" 18-to-49-year-old demographic by launching 11 new shows and changing time periods for eight existing shows was "ridiculous."

All it did was alienate its traditionally older viewers. "You don't have to be 16 to be young," said Moonves in a "mea culpa," adding that the network would get back to basics and be a "kinder, gentler CBS."

Over at NBC, the always combative Don Ohlmeyer, president, NBC West Coast, came out swinging on the issue of the V-chip — the monitoring device many politicians and pressure groups see as an antidote for TV's spreading violence.

"It's very chilling," he said, "to see what a bureaucracy,

another bureaucracy, created to somehow determine what is appropriate for you to watch or not watch ... I mean this is the first step of 'Big Brother.'"

The result, he said, is that shows such as NBC's critically acclaimed "Law & Order" and "Homicide: Life on the Street," may be V-chipped into oblivion.

At the same time, there will be prime-time anomalies like the "well-intentioned groups" who find CBS's finister "American Gothic" more family-oriented than NBC's "Friends" because its twentysomethings stars often talk about sex. "The V-chip is just the beginning," said Ohlmeyer. "Then there'll be the S-chip and then there'll be the politically incorrect chip."

PBS chief confident of future, uncertain about funding

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Public broadcasting will survive its critics in Congress, but it's just not sure who is going to pay for it, the PBS chief said Tuesday.

"The debate in Washington is no longer about whether to have public broadcasting. It is about on what basis we will have public broadcasting."

PBS President Edwin S. Duggan told the Television Critics Association. Duggan seemed more confident about the future of the Public Broadcasting Service than in previous appearances before the critics group. But he said he remains wary after repeated calls in Congress over the past two years for an end to federal financing.

The "Jazz" air date wasn't announced.

For children and parents, there's an \$8.4 million commitment from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting which funds PBS — to new fare that will begin airing in 1997 and 1998.

"Dragon Tales" is a daily animated half-hour preschool series based on dragon drawings. "Show and Tell Me" is an accompanying show for parents to help them take part in their children's learning.

Also in store is "Between the Lions," a literacy series for children ages 4 to 7 and the related "Kids and How to Grow Them" for parents.

Other upcoming programs with unannounced air dates:

- "Renzan," a three-hour documentary intended to present a "full, balanced and

fair-minded assessment" of the former president, according to a PBS release.

- "Les Miserables," a special 10th-anniversary big concert performance of the musical starring Colm Wilkinson.
- "American Lives," an examination by Duggan of five Americans who have shaped the nation.


