## Powerful dogs maul toddler

**TWIN FALLS** — A Twin Falls toddler was mauled by his neighbors' pit bull, Airedale and Great Dane while playing behind his house Wednesday afternoon. The three large dogs pierced the boy's ear, bit him repeatedly on the torso and nearly punctured his lung, said his mother, Beverly Hett-Horton. Kevin Horton, 3½, now has 27 stitches, a fear of dogs and "a doctor's appointment every other day," said Hett-Horton. He was bandaged but back at home Thursday, with a stuffed toy from ambulance workers a couple times at the hospital, she said. "We were really blessed," Hett-Horton said her son was playing in the backyard Wednesday when her tenant, Mark Moore, heard Kevin's scream from the back porch. Moore found Kevin lying on the neighbors' side of a three-foot fence that separates the two yards, with the dogs mauling him, Hett-Horton said. Moore jumped the fence and scooped up the boy, scattering the dogs, she said. "He's Kevin's hero now," she said. The animal's owners emerged from their home and yelled at the dogs before

## Avoiding bites

- Tips for dog owners:**
- Spay or neuter your pet. Most bites are inflicted by dogs that haven't been spayed or neutered.
  - Provide adequate fences.
  - Start obedience training when the dog is very young.
- Tips for parents and children:**
- Don't approach strange dogs.
  - Leave dogs alone when they're eating, sleeping or nursing puppies.
  - Don't tease dogs on chains, which tend to be more aggressive than others.
  - Teach children respect for how animals prefer to be handled.
  - Don't blow at or kiss a dog's face.
- If approached by a fierce dog:**
- Stand still and be quiet. Don't scream or run away.
  - Reprimand the dog in a low voice.
  - Back away slowly.
  - If necessary, feed the dog a coat, book, backpack or anything in your hand.

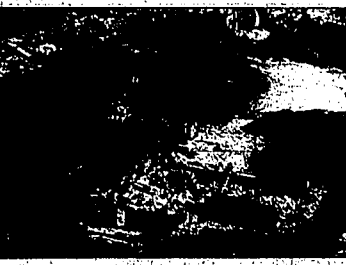

## Fires level Texas homes

**POOLVILLE, Texas** — Linda Dixon stood ankle-deep in the ashes looking for bits and pieces of her life. She wasn't having much luck. "There's nothing left," Nodding, she said, her face ruddy and covered with soot from digging in 90-degree heat. Dixon's small wood-frame ranch house was one of 65 homes destroyed by raging grass fires that continued to spread Thursday in Parker and Wise counties in north Texas, fueled by gusty winds and grass so-dry from drought that it crackled beneath one's feet. In all, some 23,000 acres had burned Thursday afternoon, down from earlier estimates, by the time firefighters had about 70 percent of the flames contained in the two counties. The grass fire near Poolville, 35 miles northwest of Fort Worth, also injured at least 49 people.

Another 90 buildings and an equal number of vehicles were also destroyed or damaged, said Joe Clement, a spokesman for the Texas Department of Safety. Unseasonably hot, windy and tinder-dry weather has been feeding fires across Texas. Gov. George W. Bush asked for a federal disaster declaration for the entire state. Officials instituted a ban on outdoor burning about a week ago. Please see TEXAS/A2

## Pop!

### Goes Gem property tax-x-x-x-x

**BOISE** — The fizz of an open pop can could become the sound of tax relief for residents of Jerome and Twin Falls counties. Under a proposal by Rep. Steve Antone, R-Rupert, for every 12-ounce container of pop produced, distributors would give 2 cents toward funding community colleges — thereby mostly removing the colleges from the property-tax rolls. On Wednesday, the House Revenue, Finance and Taxation Committee — which Antone chairs — voted to send Antone's bill to the House floor with a recommendation that it pass. It has a fighting chance there, he said. But, "it'll be tight, very tight," he added.

The tax — imposed on distributors — would average out to 2 cents a bottle for any carbonated beverage, including pop, mineral water, seltzers and fruit juices. Antone estimates that it would raise \$8 million to \$10 million annually. Magic Valley lawmakers, who have been behind several pieces of failed legislation providing property-tax relief to the counties, have broadened the appeal of the proposal to include not only the three counties who support the state's two col-



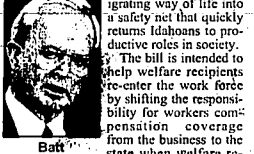

## Initial welfare reform signed

**BOISE** — Gov. Phil Batt signed into law Thursday the first piece of his welfare reform package, as the Senate approved one of the final components and forwarded it to the House. Batt hailed the legislative progress on the 44-point plan drafted by a special task force just last fall — a plan he said will turn welfare from a life into a safety net that quickly returns Idahoans to productive roles in society. The bill is intended to help welfare recipients find work by shifting the responsibility for workers' compensation coverage from the business to the state when welfare recipients are being offered unpaid work experience or training.

## Boy, 2, cares for sister after mother dies

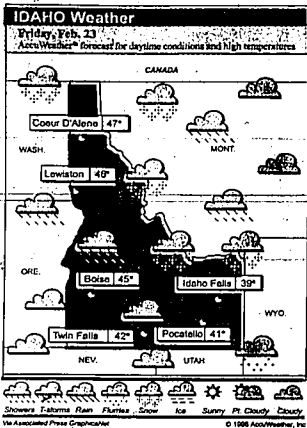

**SEATTLE** — With his 3rd birthday still two months away, Tray Hubbard is proud that heroes come in all sizes. When his mother died in her sleep last week, Tray and his 18-month-old sister Kianna were left alone in their Vancouver, Wash., townhouse. For two days, Tray took charge. He brought handfuls of dry cereal upstairs and fed them to Kianna, who was in her crib next to her mother's bed. He also unrolled and crumpled three rolls of toilet paper and stuffed them into her wet crib and dirty diaper. "He's a very devoted little guy," said Tray's grandmother, Beila Host of Beaverton, Ore. "God was watching over them." The children's mother, Patti

Jones, 36, died of natural causes sometime between Feb. 11 and 13, when she was found. Clark County deputy coroner Brian Miller said an autopsy Wednesday revealed no evidence of foul play. The autopsy did not pinpoint the cause or time of death. Jones, who grew up in Seattle and moved to Vancouver about six years ago, worked as a data-entry clerk for a freight company. She and her husband separated about a year ago. The children are now with their father. Jones' sister, Lynne Hubbard said she was puzzled by her sister's sudden death, especially because she had no known health problems. "But she wasn't surprised that her nephew figured out how to help his little sister." "He's just incredibly bright."

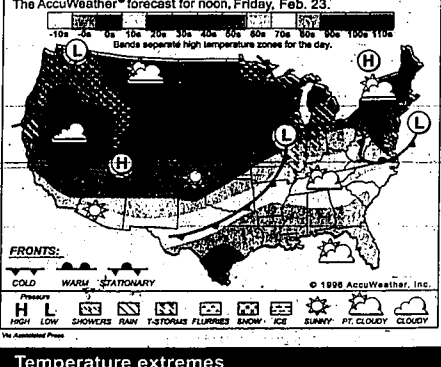

## Texans swelter in record heat; snow, rain sweep over West

An extreme avalanche warning was posted for parts of the central Sierra, and chains of snow tires were required on highways through the mountain range.

Wind gusts to 55 mph at St. George, Utah, and to 63 mph at Alta, Utah. In Colorado, wind reached 74 mph at Monument and Beulah and 67 mph at Elbert.

A snow and blowing snow advisory was posted for southern Wyoming and wind warnings were in effect across much of New Mexico. The storm's snowfall was expected to move onto the western Plains during the night.

Meanwhile, a new winter ridgeing into the Pacific Northwest with a threat of coastal rain and locally heavy snow that could extend from the Cascades to the Montana Rockies.

Summer-like weather continued across the southern Plains and Texas, where hot, dry weather has contributed to grass fires covering thousands of acres.

By early afternoon, Oklahoma City had warmed to a record 91; Abilene, Texas, hit a record 85; and Midland, Texas, tied its record of 86.

fourth of the state. They also warned of automobiles sparking dry grass, motorists tossing cigarettes or matches, and arson.

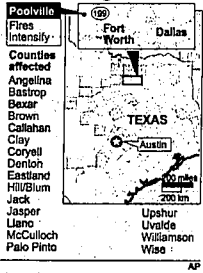
As of Thursday, almost 3,000 separate fires had consumed more than 79,000 statewide acres in the first seven weeks of 1996, and for every fire reported, eight more were unreported and dealt with locally, said Joe Schwilke, Texas A&M University Emergency Management spokeswoman.

By comparison, 1,500 fires charred 18,000 acres in all of 1995.

Other than the clothes on her back, Mrs. Dixon had managed to salvage 20-some pieces of broken dishes and one spoon, which she piled in what used to be the corner of her kitchen.

Mrs. Dixon, who ranches on a small spread with her husband and 3-year-old son, said they lost their home in a matter of minutes Wednesday.

"I had the hose going," she said, wiping the sweat from her face with her blackened work gloves. "We thought we were OK, but the wind shifted, stopped and changed direction on us. It was here just like that."

The family turned its livestock, cattle and hogs loose to fend for themselves.

"It's about all you can do," she said. "The flames were just everywhere. The heat was just so intense. The flames were jumping."

All that remained of the barn was the corrugated tin roof, which lay over a smoking heap of ashes.

Bush, who flew over Parker County to assess the damage, made state workers, National Guard helicopters and heavy equipment available to fight the blaze. He also mobilized a newly created fire-fighting task force to battle grass fires in Parker, Jack and Wise counties.

Helicopters dangling huge containers roared across the sky in frantic sorties to nearby ponds for water to quench the flames. Tanker planes swooped in dropping bright pink fire retardant.

Kevin and his rescuer made it back over the fence, she said.

According to Kevin, one of the dogs dragged the boy from his own yard and over the low wire fence, Moore said. And an animal-control officer said she found one of the boy's shoes on each side of the fence after the attack.

Dog owner John Ricks, however, has a different story.

Kevin likely climbed the fence, and the dogs were merely playing with the boy, he said. Ricks and family members own the three male dogs.

When he ran out of his home, "the dogs were just standing around" looking at Moore and the child, Ricks said.

The Times-News was unable Thursday to reach police officers who responded to the call or to obtain a police report.

If the 1½-year-old pit bull really had attacked, Ricks said, "the kid would be in the hospital still." He has warned his neighbors not to let their children tease the dogs, he said.

After Moore complained he was bitten seven months ago, the Rickses leaned a six-foot chain link fence against the shorter fence, Ricks said.

"But it falls down every once in a while," he said. "The length of chain-link fencing was lying on the ground Thursday afternoon."

The Twin Falls Animal Shelter and a private kennel are holding the three unneutered dogs during a mandatory 10-day quarantine to check for rabies, Humane Society kennel supervisor Misty Fogelsong said. After that, the dogs can go home — unless the animal shelter succeeds in efforts to have the animals destroyed, she said.

"It was a very aggressive attack" and can happen again, she said.

Today, the Rickses will install a gate on a dog run in their yard, and the three animals won't run free unless watched by their owners, Ricks said.

The Humane Society plans to serve the Rickses a citation for harboring a vicious dog, then a judge will decide the fate of the animals, Fogelsong said.

"But the situation can't wait until two months down the road when it goes to court," she said.

Idaho's Chuck McBride, at Hett-Horton's home briefly Thursday, vowed he will take justice into his own hands if the dogs come home at the end of the quarantine period.

"Then they're dead-in-10-days, he said. "I'm going to kill them."

legues through property taxes but to any county that sends students to either the College of Southern Idaho or the University of Idaho.

Counties outside the college's property tax rolls currently pay \$500 through their liquor funds for each student they send to a community college. Under Antone's proposal, they would only pay \$250 — taking a total of \$800,000 out of the pop tax revenue. The rest of the money would be divided evenly between the two colleges — about \$4 million apiece.

Business and industry representatives opposed the bill, but it drew support from beer and wine representatives and Jerry Meyerhoeffer, president of the College of Southern Idaho.

Steve Thomas, lobbyist for the Idaho Soft Drink Association, argued that the tax was unfair because it was harder on the poor than on the rich, because it would be a high tax rate for some pop sales and because soda isn't considered a vice as is liquor.

"It's a wholesome beverage, from pinicns to sporting events to just having a drink while driving at night to stay awake," he told lawmakers. "You don't hear about driving under the influence of 7-Up."

It would also put soda manufacturers at a disadvantage with competing products such as cocoa mix and milk, which aren't taxed, he said.

Steve Ahrens, president of the Idaho Association of Commerce and Industry, told lawmakers they should rely on the general fund for community colleges — or money from income and sales taxes rather than a specific product.

But Rep. Mark Stubbs, R-Twin Falls, said those areas are already stressed.

"We're fast running out of sources to fund government that are popular," he said, citing outcries over sales taxes. "Maybe we should raise the corporate income tax."

Reps. Wendy Jaquet, D-Ketchikan, and Ron Black, R-Twin Falls, urged lawmakers to approve the measure.

"Kids drink pop, and the tax is for their education," Black said. "I drink pop and I'm willing to pay for their education."

Jaquet cited the tax rebellion in Jerome and asked lawmakers to find

a stable funding source for the college.

But not all lawmakers agreed with the measure.

"A tax is a tax is a tax and we don't need right now any more tax," said Rep. Golden Linford, R-Rexburg, who voted against it.

Rep. Lenore Barrett, R-Challis, also opposed it.

"This really becomes a consumer tax because we're passing it on to the guy who goes to the store," she said.

It's one of many ideas pitched by lawmakers this year to give some property tax relief to Jerome, Twin Falls and Kootenai counties, which are the only three to fund the state's two community colleges through property taxes.

A bill sponsored by Rep. Maxine Bell, R-Jerome, to permit those counties to withdraw from the colleges' property tax rolls, died in subcommittee this week. Two bills to increase the surcharge on liquor sponsored by Black died in committee. Black has said he would hold another proposal — to shift liquor tax money from the general fund to community colleges — until he learns how the pop tax will fare.

# Navy grounds jets after latest crash

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy ordered its F-14 fighter jets worldwide to stop flying for three days after a crash Thursday in the Persian Gulf.

It was the third catastrophic loss for the Navy's front-line fighter in less than a month.

The pilot and radar intercept officer ejected safely before the early morning crash. They were rescued in the northern gulf by a helicopter from the carrier USS Nimitz, from which the F-14 was flying, officials said.

There was no hostile action involved, Navy spokesman Lt. Cmdr. Kenneth Ross said, adding that there was no immediate explanation of what went wrong.

An F-14 crashed last Sunday in the Pacific Ocean; another crashed Jan. 29 in Nashville, Tenn. Ten have gone down in the past two years and 32 since 1991, a record at least a little worse than for other planes.

"This is a mystery," said Kenneth Bacon, chief spokesman for Defense Secretary William Perry.

Two days earlier Bacon had said in response to questions about Sunday's crash, in which the two crewmen were killed, that the Navy saw no pattern in recent F-14 crashes that would call for special safety precautions.

Each of the last three planes to crash was based at Miramar Naval Air Station near San Diego, although they were from different squadrons. Six of the Navy's 13 F-14 squadrons are at Miramar. The others are at Oceana Naval Air Station in Virginia.

## Clinton wants Fed chief to stay

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Clinton said Thursday he will renominate Alan Greenspan for a third four-year term as chairman of the Federal Reserve and name White House budget director Lawrence H. White as his successor.

The president also chose St. Louis economist Laurence Meyer to fill a Fed vacancy.

Clinton praised Greenspan effusively, saying "he has inspired confidence and with good reason."

"His decisions have helped us to work toward a period of sustained economic growth," the president said during an announcement ceremony in the Oval Office.

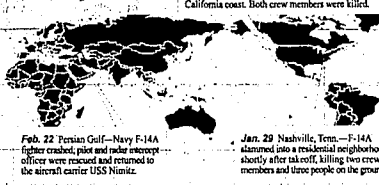
He said Rivlin, nominated as vice chairman, was one of the nation's foremost experts on how to keep the economy growing. "She always calls it as she sees it."

"I haven't lost all my powers of persuasion," the president said with a laugh. "Battered and bloodied though I may be, I can still once in a while make a good argument."

## Recent F-14 crashes

The jet crash Thursday was the 32nd F-14 accident since 1991.

Feb. 18 California coast — During exercises, a Navy F-14D crashed about 120 miles off the southern California coast. Both crew members were killed.

Immediately after Thursday's accident, Adm. Mike Boorda, the chief of naval operations, ordered a 72-hour "stand down" of the full F-14 fleet of 337 planes. In that period a team of Navy safety and engineering experts will review the latest crashes in search of common threads, officials said.

The planes cost \$32 million apiece. Bacon said the F-14s were not being grounded for a specific mechanical problem but to allow experts to "wreck their brains for any explanation, no matter how far-fetched."

The three-day hiatus also allows for a "period of reflection" for all involved in F-14 operations, including pilots, maintenance people and contractors, to reconsider their procedures and search for improvements, Bacon said.

## Institute will study blacks' education

WASHINGTON (AP) — The education of black people in America, from preschool to postgraduate, will be the focus of a new research institute announced Thursday.

"Hopefully it will have a significant impact on those who make public policy and those who are involved in philanthropy," said William H. Gray III, president of the

United Negro College Fund. Gray said the fund had raised \$5.1 million to establish the Frederick D. Patterson Research Institute in Fairfax, Va.

Allowing the institute to focus on all aspects of black education does not mean the college fund is moving away from its primary job of raising money for the nation's traditionally black colleges, Gray said.

**Clinton defense fund rises after publicity**

WASHINGTON — Donations to President Clinton's legal defense fund were declining at the end of last year but rebounded after the president said his savings might be consumed by bills in the Paula Jones and Whitewater cases.

How much of a boost the fund got won't be known until the next trustees' report in six months. But "it's been a significantly better month than the previous months have been," Michael H. Cardozo, a lawyer who oversees the trust, said Thursday.

In its first 18 months, ending Dec. 31, the trust received \$971,941 and paid \$541,134 to four law firms. That left the president's outstanding legal expenses at \$1.3 million.

The debt was eased considerably in January when two insurance companies paid \$891,880.42 under an umbrella policy to Clinton's lawyers in the Jones lawsuit. Jones, a former Arkansas state employee, has accused Clinton of sexual harassment.

**Escaped killer captured in Virginia**

STATE FARM, Va. — A killer who escaped from a maximum-security prison where he was serving eight life sentences was recaptured early Thursday afternoon, the day after he disappeared.

More than 200 officers participated in the search for Geoffrey A. Ward, who admitted to two murders and one rape in the 1980s.

Officers captured Ward near the intersection of U.S. Highways 250 and 522, across the James River and about 15 miles north of the Powhatan Correctional Facility.

Ward, 38, scaled a razor wire fence early Wednesday and fled into the foggy fields and forests of rural Powhatan County, about 20 miles west of Richmond.

**Boys: Salvi had practiced firing rifle**

DEDHAM, Mass. — John C. Salvi III went to a shooting range and practiced firing his rifle from the hip and at point-blank range the day before he killed two people at abortion clinics, two boys testified Thursday.

Prosecutors trying to prove Salvi was sane in carrying out the attack and in trying to elude capture also called witnesses who said the 23-year-old man had his hair cut short just hours after the shootings.

Salvi's lawyers argue he was insane at the time of the attack, haunted by delusions of a conspiracy against Roman Catholics.

Salvi's assault rifle with its banana clip of ammunition impressed Peter Day, 15, and his brother, who were with their stepfather at Bob's Tactical Shooting Range and Gun Shop in Salisbury on Dec. 29, 1994.

**Street dusted with cocaine; 2 arrested**

WALNUT PARK, Calif. — Two men speeding away from a traffic stop threw cocaine out the windows of their car by the handful, dusting several blocks before officers caught up to them, authorities said.

Joe Wilson, 23, and Valerio Arzate, 28, were caught Wednesday after getting tied up in traffic. They were booked for investigation of cocaine dealing and held on \$100,000 bail.

They allegedly took off when a deputy tried to stop them for a traffic violation.

Officers cordoned off two blocks and scooped up about two-thirds of a pound of cocaine. A street sweeper cleaned up about 1½ pounds more.

**Reporter held in contempt in JFK case**

NEW ORLEANS — A TV reporter was held in contempt and fined \$100 Thursday for airing the names of witnesses who testified three decades ago in Jim Garrison's grand jury investigation of President Kennedy's assassination.

In sentencing Richard Angelico of WDSU, state District Judge Frank Marullo said he was acting to protect grand jury secrecy.

Last week, Gary Raymond, a former investigator for Garrison, was held in contempt by Marullo for handing the grand jury transcripts to Angelico. Raymond is appealing his six-month jail sentence.

**Reno studies ways to keep victims up to date**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attorney General Janet Reno is exploring whether she can use closed-circuit television, travel stipends and daily recorded bulletins to help victims of the Oklahoma bombing follow the trial 500 miles away in Denver.

"We are exploring all possibilities because I think it is so very important ... that victims and survivors of violence have the chance to watch the process in action," Reno told her weekly news conference Thursday. "We're looking at the law. We're looking at the court rules. We're looking at everything we can possibly do."

On Tuesday, U.S. District Judge Richard Matsch moved the trial of Timothy McVeigh and Terry Nichols from Oklahoma to Denver to ensure that an unbiased jury could be selected. The two men are charged with the April 19, 1995, bombing of a federal building in Oklahoma City that killed 169 people and injured more than 500 others.

Federal court rules prohibit taking pictures or broadcasting by the news media from a courtroom. As recently as September 1994, the Judicial Conference of the United States, the 27-judge panel that initiates most court rules, rejected the televising of

civil or criminal federal trials. But Reno said the department was examining whether closed-circuit television could be used to show proceedings just to victims and relatives of victims.

Department lawyers have been asked to research whether any federal court ever allowed closed-circuit broadcasting to an overflow crowd, Justice spokesman Carl Stern said.

Earlier this month during a venue hearing in the trial, Judge Matsch himself allowed an audio-only feed for an overflow crowd in an adjacent courtroom. David Sellers, spokesman for the Administrative Office of U.S. Courts, could recall no precedent for closed-circuit television. But he noted that U.S. District Judge John Davies allowed an audio-only feed to an overflow press room in the same courthouse during a trial of Los Angeles police officers for the 1991 beating of Rodney King.

Reno made clear, however, that

department officials do not intend to use this case as a wedge to allow news cameras into courtrooms. "The media will have access, but not with cameras," Reno said.

Justice officials have not yet talked with the Judicial Conference about the closed-circuit idea.

Justice's Office For Victims of Crime and budget officials are exploring what travel stipends might be offered to those to go to Colorado, Reno said. "We're looking at what we would be able to do under existing budget authority."

Aileen Adams, director of the victims assistance office, said an emergency assistance fund has helped crime victims in other cases pay the cost of attending trials. The fund normally spends \$50,000 a year, mostly on housing and crisis counseling, but Adams said, "We will do everything we can to expand the money and we will find other resources, perhaps from state victim assistance programs. A 1990 federal law requires the government to make its best efforts to ensure that victims can attend all public proceedings."

**CIA wants to keep right to ask journalists to spy**

WASHINGTON (AP) — In rare cases involving "very unique and special threats" to U.S. security, the CIA must retain the authority to try and recruit journalists for spy missions, the agency's director said Thursday.

Senators pressed him to say when he'd use the authority.

With trademark secrecy, CIA Director John Deutch stopped short of saying in congressional testimony that the agency has approached American journalists or let its agents pose as reporters for U.S. news organizations.

But the disclosure that the CIA director has authority to waive a regulator's barring attempts to recruit journalists drew protests from news media executives.

"An absolute ban on the use of journalists as covers for spying should be in place," said Tom Johnson, president of CNN. "There should be no exception."

"The ban on the use of journalistic cover should be absolute," said Louis D. Boccardi, president of The

Associated Press. "The CIA should say it's not going to use the cover of journalism for the work that it does," Boccardi said.

"They have a function, and I think mixing them exposes our people all over the world to a level of danger that's extremely worrisome."

"My sympathy on this matter is very, very much with the journalistic community," Deutch told the Senate Intelligence Committee.

On the other hand, he said, "directors of central intelligence have to also concern themselves with perhaps very unique and special threats to national security where American lives are at risk."

### Keep our passionate, prickly public defender on the job

Lots of people have good reasons not to love Mike Wood.

Twin Falls County prosecutors, for example. Before they can put criminals away, they have to get past Wood. That's not easy.

And police officers. When they pinch perpetrators, Wood does his best to get the punks out.

Crime victims can't feel much affection for him, either. Not if they sit and court and watch him work doggedly to help wrongdoers escape punishment.

Wood, the Twin Falls County public defender, is nobody's picture of a hero. Most of us believe in law and order, but Wood seems to work for the other side. And dang it, he's good at it.

An incompetent public defender would make life easier on a lot of people. But that's not the way the criminal-justice system works.

The basic rule is that defendants are presumed innocent until the prosecution proves otherwise. To prevent the growth of an abusive government that tramples the rights of innocent people, every defendant must be given a fair chance to defend himself.

Unfortunately, lawyers are expensive, and most people who get busted don't have O.J. Simpson's money. So the county hires a public defender to represent those who can't afford private lawyers.

That public defender has to be vigorous. If he just goes through the motions, if he gives his client a halfhearted

defense, then the trial isn't really fair. The system breaks down.

For the past decade, Twin Falls County has been blessed or cursed, depending on your outlook, with a public defender whose efforts are never halfhearted. Wood wins a lot of cases. When he loses, he makes prosecutors earn their victories. He keeps police on their toes.

He does all this at a bargain price. The \$50,000 a year that the county pays him is a lot less than Wood could pull down if he switched from indigent clients to wealthy ones. Alternately, if he wanted, he probably could be prosecutor.

Wood apparently doesn't want those things. He has a quirky sense of mission that says defending the accused is a "patriotic" calling. It's an odd sort of calling, but lots of defendants are fortunate that he feels it.

Wood is no angel. He's prickly and combative, and sometimes his assertiveness seems to turn personal. His drunken-driving arrest last year, although he was acquitted, is troubling.

Yet Wood delivers for his clients. That fact was recognized by a screening committee that reviewed 10 applicants for Wood's job. The committee's advice to Twin Falls County commissioners was to renew Wood's contract.

The commissioners should accept that advice — and be grateful to have a public defender of Wood's caliber.



## Rejoice in Buchanan's victory

The good news is that Pat Buchanan — aside from being a racist, sexist, xenophobic, homophobic anti-Semite — is a fairly likable human being. I mean, you'd much rather have a beer with him than Bob Dole or Phil Gramm.

Número Two-o, because of the Irish persuasion, Pat Buchanan, joyous in a good fight, just loves bill-bam-pow, rejoices in a slugfest, gets off on a mudfight. Good thing, since he's in a new; What'll be really fun is watching his fellow Republicans attack him for being a racist, sexist, xenophobic, homophobic anti-Semite, which is not their native turf, as it were.

Somewhere in the Old Testament, it says, "I would that mine enemy had written a book," and Pat Buchanan has. In it, he notes that his father's heroes were Francisco Franco and Sen. Joseph McCarthy, which is enough to fritz my hair right there.

On the other hand, I'd hate to have a lot of the stuff I wrote years ago taken out of context and twisted to represent my thinking. But Buchanan is in for it, so he might as well keep up his left.

As near as we can tell, Buchanan's victory in New Hampshire is a pretty much pure win for economic populism. Neither the Christian Coalition nor the anti-abortion movement count for much there, especially compared to Iowa.

What's even more interesting is that the state is not in an economic recession. That vote is a direct reflection of just how worried people are about their future in this two-tier economy. And there's what Bob Herbert calls "a cosmic disconnect" between what people are actually worrying about and what the Republicans are doing in Washington.

There are two problems with Buchanan as a populist.

One is all the divisive garbage, he brings with him. It's exactly what has been used to destroy populist surges in the past — setting whites against blacks, natives against immigrants, men against women, straights against gays, Christians against Jews — divide, divide, divide — and lose.

Look, Hispanic farm workers are not responsible for the savings and loan mess, blacks on welfare are not moving factories to Taiwan, lowering the tax on capital gains is not part of the "gay agenda," and Jews, having been historically discriminated against, by and large support raising the minimum wage.

The second problem is that Buchanan's economic populism is rudimentary. It's one thing to recognize that there's a gap between the rich and everybody else is growing like a cancer; it's another thing to come up with useful solutions. It's fine to jump on trade and economic globalization, but that's only part of the problem, and not a very big part at that. Nor is gut-tung jingoism the solution. Buchanan still favors trickle-down

economies — he wants to cut inheritance taxes, the capital gains tax and taxes on the rich.

The only people I see in public office trying to address what's wrong with this economy are Labor Secretary Robert Reich and Massachusetts Sen. Ted Kennedy.

Reich has been valiantly struggling to get raising the minimum wage on his boss' agenda and coming up with one improvement and suggestion after another on worker training.

Kennedy came out with a multipronged plan earlier this month to attack what he calls "the quiet Depression," which contains a lot of carrots as well as sticks to get corporations to do the Right Thing. (Somebody even conservatives are going to notice that Ted Kennedy is the most effective senator in Washington: He has a wonderful habit of getting Republicans like Nancy Kassebaum and even Orrin Hatch to co-sponsor good legislation.)

Kennedy's plan covers the Federal Reserve Board, proposes a two-tier corporate tax plan to favor those that treat workers well, closes lots of stinky corporate tax loopholes, puts brakes on mergers and acquisitions, helps small business, helps labor, helps secure pension plans and more. Bushman would do well to study it.

Meanwhile, the Republicans in Congress are so lost in loonyland that they're now cutting off their nose to spite our face.

President Clinton nominated Felix Rohatyn, a 'guy so smart that Wall Street is in awe of him, to the Federal Reserve Board, where it was expected he would get to work to study it.

Monumental Alan Greenspan. The Republicans wouldn't even let the nomination out of committee because it might reflect credit on Clinton.

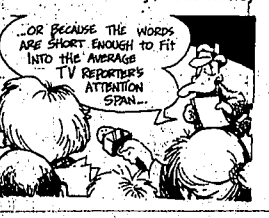

# Sen. Dole's 'extremist' warnings could backfire

WASHINGTON — It was two days before the New Hampshire primary and Pat Buchanan was shaking his hotel room, shaking his head in bewilderment at a Bob Dole television ad labeling Buchanan "too extreme" to be president.

"Why is my old friend doing this to me?" Buchanan asked a visitor. "Go back over this entire campaign. I have never said anything harsh about Bob Dole. But he left me no choice."

The wisdom of the decision to cast Buchanan as an extremist is being hotly debated within the Dole campaign and in broader GOP circles, where many believe that it is Dole who went to extremes with his criticism.

In the final days of the New Hampshire campaign, Buchanan launched ads criticizing Dole for supporting billions in tax increases and said the Senate majority leader had sided with big banks and corporations on trade and foreign aid deals that Buchanan says cost American jobs.

And as Buchanan campaigned Thursday in Arizona, he suggested Dole and others who say Buchanan risks dividing the party ought to look in the mirror.

"I've always supported the Republican nominee," he said. "But I tell you, the name calling is making it very difficult for my people and my movement to support someone who's called me a lot of names."

Publicly, Dole aides defended the strategy. "None whatsoever," Dole campaign manager Scott Reed said when asked if he had any doubts about the anti-Buchanan ad and subsequent attacks.

Dole has stuck to the script, framing the race as "between main-

stream conservatism and extremism." A radio version of the New Hampshire ad is being aired in South Carolina.

Several top Dole advisers have opposed the strategy from the outset. Some believe the ad cost Dole a victory in New Hampshire, by motivating Buchanan voters and feeding into his rivals' complaints that a desperate Dole was going negative.

Some outside strategists warn that in labeling Buchanan extreme, Dole is casting aspersions on Buchanan voters, a constituency that will be critical to whoever carries the GOP banner against President Clinton in the fall.

Ralph Reed, executive director of the Christian Coalition, compared the attacks on Buchanan to those leveled at religious broadcaster Pat Robertson when he sought the 1988 GOP nomination.

"I do not think it is wise to attack what is a fourth to a third of the Republican primary electorate as ipso facto extremist and intolerant,"

and on his influence on the eventual Republican Party platform. In Turkey, where the anti-Western, pro-Islamic Welfare party won general elections on Dec. 24, the newspaper *Hurriyet* wrote that "a fascist bomb" had fallen on the American election scene.

Not all was negative abroad for Buchanan, who disclaims any notions that he is racist or anti-Semitic. Russian ultranationalist Vladimir Zhirinovskiy, a candidate in June presidential elections, congratulated Buchanan Thursday as "a comrade and brother-in-arms."

Zhirinovskiy, who has made no secret of his own anti-Semitism and disdain for foreigners, said

Reed said in an interview. "Democrats have tried that line for years and Christian conservatives not only reject it, but resent it."

Even if Dole ultimately emerges as the nominee, Buchanan's early success has virtually assured him of a major role at the GOP convention. Given that, many social conservatives now believe it would be almost impossible for any nominee to suggest changes in the party's anti-abortion platform plank or pick a running mate who supports abortion rights.

From here on out, the party's soul cannot be for sale," Gary Bauer of the conservative Family Research Council wrote in an analysis of Buchanan's early strength.

Buchanan also is drawing 1992 Ross Perot supporters and blue-collar voters to the GOP ranks. Indeed, Buchanan's narrow New Hampshire win came because of support in blue-collar areas. While most GOP operatives predicted Buchanan would suffer if turnout was high, a

Buchanan's "slogans are close and understandable to us. Especially your words, 'America for Americans.'"

But through most of the world, the reaction to Buchanan's win in the United States' first 1996 primary was one of fear.

In Mexico, a frequent target of Buchanan's speeches, many were afraid that his success would feed racial hostility in the United States. Buchanan has said he would use troops and build walls along the Mexican border to stop illegal immigration.

"His attitude should worry every person who has analyzed his actions and statements," said Mexican congressman Carlos Reina Martinez.

record number of voters participated in the GOP primary and Buchanan won nonetheless.

"That's why these attacks are both stupid and silly," Buchanan said in an interview. "You bring the Perot and Buchanan people into the Republican Party and it becomes a majority movement."

Without taking sides in the Dole-Buchanan spat, Republican National Committee Chairman Haley Barbour said it was critical not to alienate "the large number of Perot

voters and independents and working men and women who are looking to get Clinton out of the White House and knew voting in the Republican primary was the right place to start."

South Carolina Gov. David Beasley, a Dole supporter, said he would "leave strategic decisions to the people paid to make them." But Beasley pointed to his own successful campaign, when Democrats labeled him a tool of an extremist religious right.

"Everyone tries to paint labels," Beasley said. "Sometimes they stick and sometimes they don't."

## Perot wants to clean up Congress

DES MOINES, Wash. (AP) — Billionaire Ross Perot joined forces with an unlikely alliance of liberals and conservatives Wednesday night to urge grassroots support for congressional campaign finance limits.

Perot and other backers of the "Clean Congress" measure said Pat Buchanan's surprise success in the New Hampshire primary reflects voter unhappiness with the status quo in Washington, D.C., and voter alienation from candidates who bankroll campaigns with gifts from special interests.

Much of the runaway spending seems to go for mudslinging ads, Perot said. "The American people are sick of negative campaigns. Iowa and New Hampshire sent a real message. The American people are like Joe Friday: 'Just the facts, Ma'am.'"

Perot was the drawing card for a "town meeting" of about 1,100 activists, one of a series of 10 gatherings scheduled for the spring to turn up the heat under Congress to pass the campaign finance bill this year. Perot was joined by liberal Sen. Patrick Murray, D-Wash., two of the state's most conservative politicians, Republicans Reps. Linda Smith and Jack Metcalf, Rep. Marty Meacham, D-Mass.; and national leaders of Common Cause, Public Citizen and the League of Women Voters.

## Win provokes worldwide worry

The victory of "America-first" presidential candidate Pat Buchanan in New Hampshire's Republican primary set off alarm bells worldwide.

A Norwegian newspaper compared the Republican candidate's rhetoric to 1930s Europe, and the Edinburgh Scotsman said bluntly: "Heil Buchanan."

From Mexico to Japan, people worried aloud what Buchanan's protectionist and isolationist policies might mean for the rest of the world — even if he doesn't win the GOP nomination or get elected president.

**Paper details military preparations in China**

HONG KONG (AP) — China has sanctioned an unusually detailed newspaper report about war games it plans to conduct across from Taiwan with the apparent aim of intimidating Taiwanese right before their presidential elections.

In recent weeks, Hong Kong newspapers have published reports that China is gearing up for a large-scale military exercise in the southeast province of Fujian, which faces Taiwan.

The exercise has been interpreted as yet another menacing move intended to cool Taiwan's desire to raise its international profile. Taiwan estimates that China has moved 150,000 troops into Fujian.

China is extremely secretive about its military, and only last week, its foreign ministry spokesman, Shen Guofang, said he had no knowledge of any exercise.

But Thursday, the Chinese-funded newspaper Wen Wei Po, based in

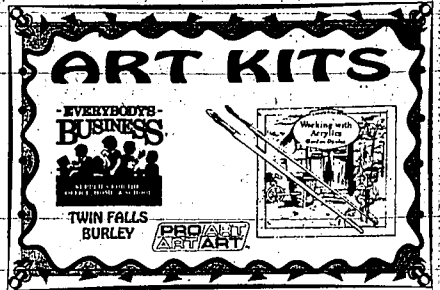
Hong Kong, reported in a dispatch about lunar New Year celebrations that holiday chitchat had given way to talk of troops, war games and tensions with Taiwan.

The article in the Chinese-language newspaper did not provide any information about planned maneuvers, troop strength, or other details. But it did discuss military activity in Fujian province and — though low on statistics — it was clearly intended to signal to Taiwan

that the war games will take place.

By releasing details about military preparations in Fujian, China would also seem to be trying to influence the Taiwanese election by sending another pointed message: If Taiwanese voters return President Lee Teng-hui to office, they can expect more friction with China.

Lee is expected to win handily, even though tensions with China have unsettled the Taiwanese people and the island's financial markets.



**Saudi king stages easy comeback**

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Resuming his duties after a three-month illness, King Fahd has defied skeptics who said the elderly, ailing monarch would never return to rule Saudi Arabia, the world's largest oil exporter.

Fahd, who is in his 70s, became sick in late November. The ailment has never been officially disclosed, but he is overweight and has diabetes.

His illness sent jitters through petroleum markets and raised speculation about the political future of the desert kingdom, the linchpin of Western policy in the Gulf.

Fahd handed over power on Jan. 1 to his half-brother and heir apparent, Crown Prince Abdullah, and many assumed Fahd's reign was effectively over after 13 years.

But the move proved only temporary. "Having spent a period of rest and convalescence, God has bestowed on me a cure and good health," Fahd said in a letter Wednesday announcing his return.

The king said the decree handing state duties to Abdullah had "expired," the Saudi Press Agency reported Thursday.

Abdullah, in a sign the royal family wants to put forward a unified front, praised Fahd's return.

World oil markets reacted calmly Thursday.

Fahd's comeback also eased concerns that the more than 5,000 princes in the Al Saud dynasty would use his illness to jockey for power in the kingdom of 17 million people.

**Muslim leader urges unity**

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP) — Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan-pledged for Islamic unity Thursday, ending a tour that included meetings with Saddam Hussein and Moammar Gadhafi and provoked U.S. government condemnation.

"If we Muslims can come together all over the world we could become the superpower of the 21st century. And that is the fear in the West," he told a gathering of about 100 students in Kuala Lumpur.

"Those who fear Islam fear that Islam is going to replace the Western hegemony in the world, and they are right," he said.

Farrakhan began his 18-nation tour, which included visits to Iraq, Iran, Libya, Nigeria and Sudan, only four months after his Million Man March was thought to have brought him somewhat closer to the political mainstream.

A bomb destroyed Bridget Campbell's 1994 black Jeep at 745 Blue Lakes Blvd. S., outside Twin Falls city limits. Seven minutes later, another explosion damaged an older model pickup truck at 336 Filer Ave. owned by John Brent Richardson in Twin Falls.

No one was injured in the blasts. Thursday, Twin Falls County Sheriff

Wayne Tousey announced that the bombings are connected with a Jan. 7 explosion, in which a car owned by Steve Thompson, a 27-year-old roofer, blew up outside his home at 217 Adams Street, Twin Falls.

Tousey said they were connected through "fact and association," but he declined to elaborate. Police detectives so far have found no link between the victims, and results of forensic tests on the bomb debris from Thompson's car are still unavailable, Axtman said.

### Kimberly fire crews douse chimney blaze

KIMBERLY - City fire crews made quick work of a chimney fire Thursday afternoon, dousing flames before the fire could spread to the surrounding structure.

The fire, which broke out at 416 Main S., shortly after 4 p.m., was extinguished within an hour, Kimberly City Fire Commander Jerry Morton said.

"There was no reportable loss, meaning no damage to the structure and no injuries," Morton said. "Basically all it burned was the crocstone in the chimney."

The house is owned by Gene Kafader, who was home when the fire started.

### Twin Falls County officials say they'll seek another term

TWIN FALLS - Two county commissioners said Thursday they'll run for reelection this fall.

Republican Commissioner Marvin Hempleman's plans for a modular-home development went awry, so he'll try to keep the seat that he's held since 1981, he said. Brent Reinke, a commissioner for nearly two years, said he'll also be a candidate in the Republican primaries.

Perennial political candidate Donald McMurrin has announced he plans to run for Reinke's seat unless county Democrats "come up with someone else to run."

Candidates for District 1 commissioner, District 2 commissioner, sheriff or prosecutor can file petitions of candidacy from March 25 to April 5, deputy clerk Larry Haycock said. A \$40 fee and the signatures of five registered voters are required, but the Legislature could change those requirements before the filing period, he said.

Candidates for county commissioner must be U.S. citizens at least 21 years old. They must live in the county for one year - and in their district for 90 days - before the election, Haycock said.

### Police find drugs, handguns during routine traffic stop

TWIN FALLS - A man was charged Thursday on a felony drug charge in connection with the seizure of 19 grams of amphetamine from a pickup he was driving Wednesday night, police said.

Police pulled over 25-year-old Jose Rebolledo-Mendoza at 11:23 p.m. Wednesday for driving without lens covers on the rear lights of his pickup; police confiscated from the pickup the drugs and two handguns, one loaded, the report said.

A passenger, 33-year-old Miguel Montero, was carrying a \$4,000 handheld "night vision" device, used for seeing objects in the dark, the report said. The report said Montero owned the loaded gun, but it didn't elaborate. He was not charged with any crime.

"What they were doing with (the device) I don't know," said Lt. Ron Axtman of the Twin Falls Police Department.

Rebolledo-Mendoza was charged with felony possession of amphetamine with intent to deliver. Bail was set at \$20,000, according to court minutes.

### American Falls water heads for Magic Valley next week

BURLEY - The Snake River has been running lately, but it should start raining in a week when higher flows from American Falls Reservoir assert themselves in the Magic Valley.

On Thursday, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation boosted releases from American Falls to 11,000 cubic feet of water per second, one off its usual 449 gallons per minute. The higher flows are the biggest February releases in a decade.

With Upper Snake River reservoirs nearly full and hefty snowpacks in the mountains, the bureau has no option but to release water from American Falls.

"There's a good chance we'll stay at this level and increase from there," said Mark Croghan, a Burley-based bureau hydrologist. The bureau may make flow adjustments in early March, when updated streamflow forecasts are released.

It could take a week or more for the higher flows to become noticeable downstream of Lake Walcott Reservoir, near Rupert. The reservoir has been low throughout the winter, because of construction at Minidoka Dam; it will have to fill some before downstream flows mirror upstream flows.

## Ex-migrant teaches Hispanics about live-saving measures

TWIN FALLS - If her students are only available for an hour or so at 6 a.m., Christine Hernandez will promptly show up at their homes. Going wherever Hispanics live is part of her daily routine.

And if the former migrant worker can't find someone at home, Hernandez heads for the fields.

"If I have to, I'll pick up a hoe," the 35-year-old American Red Cross educator said. "I know what it is to have to work and not be able to stop, especially if you're getting paid by the acreage."

"I have to be here for them whenever they can do it."

As the Red Cross Sawtooth Chapter's Hispanic coordinator, Hernandez teaches about cardiopulmonary resuscitation, first aid and AIDS.

Even when Hernandez isn't on the clock she's available free of charge. After a Spanish-speaking Jerome woman called at 1 a.m. because she was in labor, Hernandez not only directed the woman and her husband to a hospital, but she met them there. She left 6 1/2 hours later after the baby was born and being assured an interpreter was available.

Ever since she was an 8-year-old migrant worker traveling through Arizona, Oregon and Idaho and filling out forms for

Spanish-speaking parents, Hernandez was determined to help people.

People such as Evan Falconberg. The Jackpot woman, who speaks and understands some English, said Thursday the only way she could learn about CPR and first aid was by attending classes taught in Spanish.

Falconberg and four other parents at the Jackpot Head Start on Thursday are parents who want to be prepared if something happens to a family member or friend.

Since Hernandez started coordinating the only such Hispanic Red Cross program in Idaho in October 1994, she has helped more than 300 people learn CPR and First Aid, and three Burley women are now instructors.

Because of Hernandez, two women also have volunteered for Red Cross disaster

## BLM analyst decides she won't take Idaho post

WASHINGTON - A woman who made her career working inside the Washington Beltway abruptly decided not to take a top Bureau of Land Management post in southern Idaho.

## Ag picture brightens, expert says

BURLEY - Higher agricultural commodity prices have placed the Mini-Cassia area on solid economic ground, but all of Idaho would benefit from a cap on state spending, a local financial expert told bankers and "community" members Wednesday.

Twin Falls accountant and commodity broker Alex Sinclair also told listeners that the Magic Valley shouldn't count itself out of the run to land a high-tech manufacturer such as Micron.

"I would urge you to keep the door open and woo Micron," Sinclair said. "Micron was very impressed with the Magic Valley and the Magic Valley proposal."

Despite the death of his mother Wednesday night in a car accident in Arizona, Sinclair delivered a positive and sometimes passionate message about the local, state and national economy.

"We've been in this treadmill since the Vietnam war," run by constant inflation and a decline in American production quality, he said. "It's over. We have a soft recovery."

For the agriculturally-dependent Magic Valley, the news is even better. While trading prices for potatoes, wheat and beans are high, the forecast is just as bright, said Sinclair, the former president of Sinclair & Co., a Twin Falls stock and commodity brokerage.

"A lot of things are happening in agriculture that I think are very, very positive. We will see relatively positive prices on those commodities (potatoes, wheat and beans) over the next two years," he said.

Low inventories of grains nationwide will help keep those prices high, he added.

Several strong years of commodities prices could stir retail growth in the area too, boosting a Mini-Cassia market that is already doing well, Sinclair said.

## Rickards annoys lawmakers

BOISE - Twin Falls foot doctor, renegade Republican and Congressional candidate Peter Rickards has managed to raise more than a few hackles at the Statehouse.

On Thursday he left phone messages with several Magic Valley legislators challenging them to allow voters to decide whether to keep the nuclear waste agreement Gov. Phil Batt forged with the Department of Energy and the Navy last fall.

"Since you all are happy in your ignorance, let see (sic) if the Idaho people are any smarter than you are ... they can't be any stupider," said the transcript of his phone message.

Reached by phone Thursday, Rickards acknowledged that the message was his.

"In fact, it was toned down, he said. "I think I edited myself fairly well," he said.

He is assisting the Snake River Alliance in running an initiative to allow voters to reject or accept the governor's nuclear waste agreement - but he says lawmakers can do it faster. If they approve a referendum, then initiative sponsors would have to collect 41,335 names to get it on the ballot this fall.

But Rickards' brusque language has succeeded in stirring up a mixture of irritation and amusement among a handful of lawmakers both Republican and Democrat.

# Northern Utah schools won't consider club ban

OGDEN, Utah (AP) — Northern Utah school districts say they are not considering a ban on extracurricular clubs to keep gay and lesbian clubs off campus, as the Salt Lake District decided this week.

"There hasn't been any real serious discussion from the levels I've dealt with," said Ralph Aardema, director of secondary education for the Ogden School District.

Box Elder School Superintendent Steven Laing, Morgan Superintendent Dale Christensen, Weber School District Superintendent Steve Mecham and Davis Assistant Superintendent Steve Ronnenkamp also said they don't know of any move to do away with extracurricular clubs.

"The superintendents say no students have asked to start gay and lesbian support groups."

The Salt Lake School District board voted Tuesday to ban all extracurricular clubs rather than allow a gay and lesbian support club to meet at East High School. Students at three other schools also wanted to form such clubs.

The federal Equal Access Act forbids districts from allowing some clubs and not others based on their content. It was originally sought by those who wanted Bible clubs. The law does not apply to clubs tied to classes, such as a science club.

Mecham said the Weber school board opposes federal intervention at the district level and may be inclined to act as the Salt Lake

board did.

"My sense is that most districts will go the way of the Salt Lake district (if approached)," Mecham said.

Laing said the Box Elder district's school board has been watching "very carefully" the Salt Lake schools' struggles with the issue.

"We aren't at a point where we're ready to take action," Laing said, adding that the Box Elder school board would consider the actions of the Legislature and the Salt Lake district in making its decision.

"Our board will have to decide if they want to take a similar action or if they want to approach it with a more open policy."

In Morgan, Christensen said many of the clubs do a lot of service for the community and banning them would be unfortunate.

"On the other hand, if that's what it will take to show our concern about retaining a standard we can all live with, commiserate with the community, it may ultimately prove to be beneficial," he said.

Ronnenkamp said Davis County is awaiting legislative action.

Since then, two bills addressing gay clubs have been filed. One would require parental consent for participation in clubs that meet on school grounds. The other would prevent school employees and volunteers from supporting illegal conduct, such as sodomy.

# Tax hike decision postponed

BOISE (AP) — The Idaho Legislature has delayed at least until May decisions whether to increase the state fuel tax or registration fees to shake loose more money for highway construction.



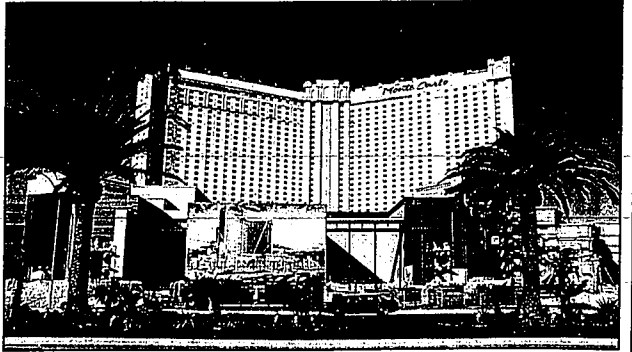
The House Transportation and Defense Committee had hoped to decide the issue Thursday afternoon, but Chairman Rep. Joan Wood said paperwork on new proposals couldn't be completed in time.

Her committee will have a number of options to decide Monday:

- A bill from an interim study committee creating a special fund dedicated to construction work and funded by a 4-cent per gallon fuel tax increase and increases in the registration fees for light trucks cars. It would generate about \$34 million per year. If approved, the fuel tax increase would go into effect in July and the registration fees next year.
- A bill increasing only the registration fees, which would raise \$7.5 million per year.
- A measure that would raise Idaho's current 21-cent-per-gallon fuel tax to 25 cents, effective April 1, providing \$6-million-to-help-rebuild flood-damaged northern Idaho highways and \$29.2 million a year for routine construction.

Some of the measures were introduced at a hurried session of the House Ways and Means Committee Thursday afternoon. House Speaker Michael Simpson sponsored some of the bills, saying he wanted to give the Transportation Committee a number of options.

# Heavy bookings reported for Monte Carlo casino

LAS VEGAS (AP) — When you're naming your resort after the playground of princes, you'd better be something special.

And two of the nation's top gaming companies think they've come up with the answer in the Monte Carlo Resort and Casino, a new \$344 million megaresort scheduled to open June 21.

"Monte Carlo is going to be the value leader on the ritziest stretch of the Las Vegas Strip," said Glenn Schaeffer, president and chief financial officer of Circus Circus Enterprises, Inc.

The goal of the new resort is to "hark back to the era when Monaco was the playground of the princes," Schaeffer said in an interview Tuesday.

The opulent 3,014-room resort is modeled after the famous Place du Casino in Monte Carlo, Monaco.

Apparently the resort is catching the public's fancy.

With the opening still four months away, Monte Carlo has already sold more than 50 percent of the resort's room nights for the first year of operation, Schaeffer said.

He credits the room rates — \$59 to \$119 — as being a major draw. "You won't be leaving the palace for the price," he said, coining a mar-

keting phrase.

The new hotel is a joint venture of Circus Circus, the first company to carve a niche in the family market, and Mirage Resorts, Inc.

Monte Carlo will have a certain appeal to families, with features such as the Easy River ride, a wave pool, and an arcade.

"On our street of dreams, an old time Victorian square, there will be an arcade and other forms of entertainment for what we call children of all ages," he said.

"But I think it's understood that Las Vegas is principally an adult venue and because we've become the leading entertainment destination in the United States, if not the world, we have to offer a little something to everybody. We attract the golden grays, the baby boomers, the generation X crowd, so we have to have something for every part of the market to draw as well as Las Vegas does."

Schaeffer said the construction period on Monte Carlo — 15 months from ground breaking to opening — "is a record for any hotel-casino in Las Vegas, and I think a record in the United States for a building of that scale."

On a walk through of the 32-story hotel Wednesday, sales manager

Ken Haas pointed out features ranging from a food court featuring names such as McDonald's, to an area that will feature fine restaurants.

High rollers unaccustomed to digging with the masses will have their own kitchen where they can order delicacies without having to travel too far from the gaming tables.

In the floodlit casino area, construction workers toiled into the night placing ornate moldings in chandeliered domed sections.

In back of the resort, workers craned Gothic arches, which are transported to the front of the building, or the top of the structure via giant cranes.

Off the casino is an elegant, towering 1,200-seat theater which will feature magician Lance Burton.

The resort will recreate the grandeur of its namesake city on the French Riviera with features such as fancy arches, marble floors, ornate fountains and gas-lit promenades.

The Monte Carlo is one of three megaresorts opening in Las Vegas this year.

The Stratosphere Hotel, Casino and Tower is scheduled to open in April and the New York-New York Hotel-Casino is set to open in December.

**Farm Bureau feud surfaces in ag budget**

BOISE (AP) — The schism in the Idaho Farm Bureau Federation surfaced again on Thursday in a fight over the salary of a Batt administration operative who was ousted 15 months ago as the chief lobbyist for the state's largest farm organization.

"I'm sorry personalities got involved in this," Republican Rep. Maxine Baile said after budget writers as she pushed to eliminate \$15,000 from the Agriculture Department budget that goes toward the salary of Jim Yost.

Baile has been mentioned by some as a potential successor to Tom Geary, Farm Bureau president.

But the committee rejected the attempt by the Jerome farmer on an 11-8 vote. Several members, including the panel's senior Democrat, praised Yost's recent efforts in putting together a 1996 salmon-recovery plan that has garnered the support of every interest in the state except unyielding GOP Congressman Helen Chenoweth.

"Many times I have not been in Mr. Yost's side of the circle, but he did give us an understanding on the fish, and it's important for that to continue," Democratic Sen. Marguerite McLaughlin of Orofino said.

Republican Rep. Dan Mader of Lewiston said much the same thing and told Baile he would oppose anything that would jeopardize Yost's job.

"This in no way diminishes Mr. Yost's abilities," Baile said.

Yost was forced out as the organization's point man with the Legislature shortly after the 1994 election by then-executive director Bill Brown in what appeared to many to be an odd reaction to the over-riding GOP victory and the election of the first Republican governor in 24 years.

Yost, with solid GOP credentials and a record of legislative effectiveness, was replaced by Greg Nelson, who had served as agriculture director for Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus and contributed significantly more money to Batt's Democratic opponent than he gave to the winner.

Brown's maneuver resulted in the internal division between southern and northern Idaho Farm Bureau activists and the eastern Idaho hierarchy to surface publicly and reportedly led to an earlier than planned selection of a successor to Brown.

Yost eventually was hired by the Batt administration as a natural resource consultant and eventually placed on the Idaho staff of the Northwest Power Planning Council.

**Governor won't seek re-election**

OLYMPIA (AP) — Embattled Gov. Mike Lowry, pummeled by last year's sexual harassment allegations and continuing poor poll standings, announced Thursday he won't run for re-election this fall.

The rookie Democratic governor, with wife, Mary, by his side, said he had discussed his election plans with his family over the weekend and reached his decision Wednesday night.

"At the time the decision was made, I felt the right thing to do was to announce it," Lowry said.

Lowry's decision creates a wide-open race for the Democratic nomination in September. He had already drawn two primary challengers.

**Militia leader challenges court**

WENATCHEE, Wash. (AP) — The head of a militia group in court for hitting a police officer made life difficult for a Chelan County judge, quibbling over procedural matters.

Bruce Alden Banister, 29, of East Wenatchee, was summoned into court Wednesday on a felony charge of third-degree assault against an officer and resisting arrest.

He's accused of fighting with a Wenatchee police officer who issued him a citation for having expired license tabs Feb. 4.

Banister leads the Wenatchee

Minuteman Militia, which doesn't recognize municipal police forces and views driver's and vehicle licenses as unconstitutional.

In Chelan County Superior Court on Wednesday, Banister refused to participate in the proceedings because the prosecutor's office had capitalized the spelling of his name on court documents.

Banister repeatedly frustrated the efforts of Judge Carol Wardell to determine whether he wanted an attorney and to establish his address so he could remain out of jail until his next court date, March 4.

work, such as translating for fire victims, and Hernandez has done classes about AIDS for about 150 people. Last summer, 40 children took swimming lessons, and more are planning to learn how to swim this summer.

And Hernandez is just what the local Red Cross needed, said Sawtooth Chapter Manager Ruth Young. When Young started her job in 1990, she realized the Red Cross needed someone to work with Hispanics, but none of the volunteers

could speak Spanish well.

Yet, even though Hernandez is a bilingual Texas native and Mexican-American, she still has some trouble gaining the trust of Hispanic people in the Magic and Wood River valleys, she said.

"I guess, in a way, Hispanic culture is 'Keep to yourself,'" Hernandez said. "They're getting used to me, so they kind of open up to me now."

Besides helping people learn life-saving skills, Hernandez can show Hispanics that being a migrant work-

er — which she enjoyed and is proud of — isn't their only alternative.

A high school dropout, Hernandez got her general-equivalency diploma after deciding to settle in Idaho when she was 18. She also got an associate's degree from the College of Southern Idaho and a bachelor's degree from Idaho State University.

Now Hernandez is taking classes so she can counsel Hispanic substance abusers.

"I'm the kind of person who can't sit still, so I take night classes," added the wife and mother of four.

should appoint "somebody with experience, preferably a Westerner, and they should at least have a little natural-resource experience."

Idaho's congressional delegation opposed Sita's appointment, Smurthwaite said, adding: "They made no secret that they were less than pleased with her appointment."

However, the lawmakers made no formal complaint over the matter nor did current BLM employees, Smurthwaite added.

"It was a culmination of things that led Sherry to make the decision that her effectiveness may be impaired," he said.

Sens. Larry Craig and Dirk Kempthorne and Rep. Mike Crapo,

all Republicans, met with Sita on Feb. 14 in Washington to "get to know her," according to Craig's spokesman Bryan Wilkes.

"However, they questioned her about several issues and basically they found her not to be qualified," he said.

BLM's Idaho State Director Martha Hahn chose Sita for the job after they worked together for two months last summer when Sita was an acting manager for the BLM's Boise District as part of an Interior Department management-training program, Smurthwaite said.

Sita will continue management training in the BLM's Washington office of legislative affairs. Hahn could not be reached for comment Thursday.

Sita was chosen because "the role of the district manager is changing somewhat," Smurthwaite said.

"We're looking more for good communicators, people who can build coalitions, and Sherry is the kind of person who could have done that well."

Howard Hedrick, a resources coordinator in the BLM state office, will serve as acting district manager for the Upper Snake River Districts until another appointment is made. The job opened when Mary Gaylord moved to a BLM office in Denver.

The Upper Snake River Districts include offices in Shoshone, Burley, Idaho Falls, Pocatello and Malad City.

"When people use that language, you don't win people," said Rep. Ron Black, R-Twin Falls, who added that the message seemed desperate.

Rep. Doug Jones, R-Filer, shrugged his shoulders at it. "It takes all kinds of people to make the world go around," he said.

Rickards offended the very lawmaker he was intending to help — Sen. Clint Stennett, D-Ketchum, whose bill to allow voters a say in the nuclear waste agreement is locked up in a committee chairman's desk drawer.

"I don't need that kind of support," Stennett said. "This Legislature works hard and does the best they can. I abhor anybody who doesn't treat them with respect."

On the other hand, Rep. Mark Stubbs, R-Twin Falls, said he wasn't offended by the message. Rickards has consistently raised important questions about the nuclear waste debate, he said — namely potential burial of plutonium particles.

"I respect his attempts to find out about the problem," he said. "I'd take him more seriously if he weren't so confrontational."

As Rickards prepares a primary



challenge against U.S. Rep. Mike Crapo, most lawmakers say he doesn't have a ghost of a chance.

Rickards, however, disagrees. He has recently challenged Crapo to introduce a constitutional amendment requiring a state to get voter approval before beginning a

nuclear-energy related project — be it power plants or storage facilities — and said he would introduce that proposal if elected.

Lawmakers are ducking behind partisanship to protect the governor, he said.

"To me, the local legislators are showing that party politics is more important than protecting Idaho's health and our water," he said. "I definitely want to stimulate them in any way, shape or form."

Even if that means insulting them.

"I am not interested in browbeating my way up the Republican party," he said. "They may think I'm offending them, but I think they're offending the people."

But the area cannot rely on the agriculture market forever, he warned, and must diversify by drawing in more high-paid manufacturing jobs. The current wave of retail job creation is not enough to sustain a vibrant economy.

Even with local economic factors favoring growth, Sinclair hammered at the state government's spending expansion.

State spending increased 14.1 percent in 1995, he said.

"We will hit the California brick wall if we don't slow it down," said Sinclair, comparing the last year's

spend-easy legislature with California's recent economic crisis.

"We must control overall state spending. We must put a cap on state spending in Idaho."

Any cap on state spending should be tied to the inflation rate and population growth, Sinclair said, both indicators of an economy's strength.

"The era of government stimulating the economy is over," he added. "Less government will give us a higher standard of living."

As Idaho settles down following a period of booming population, economic growth will depend more upon eliminating interior barriers —

such as government spending — than external influences.

One promising prospect for growth is outside Idaho's borders, Sinclair said. Mexico, as a result of the North American Free Trade Agreement, will gradually become a better market for Idaho agricultural products as well as other U.S.-made items.

Exploiting that market will mean increased competition, a factor Sinclair urged Idahoans to live up to.

"Let's not be afraid of the challenge of competition. Let's take the challenge and move forward," Sinclair said.

### Horizon adds flight, drops prices

Horizon officials met in Lewiston last fall with a group of business travelers who complained about the lack of seats available and the cost of the flights.

SALT LAKE CITY — Weeks of record high temperatures came to an abrupt end Thursday as a snowstorm preceded by gusts of up to 56 miles per hour ripped through northern Utah, tangling traffic, cutting off power and closing canyon roads.

The House Education Committee Thursday advanced legislation diverting at least \$6 million per year from lottery profits into a fund to help school districts pay for buildings.

A day earlier, the Revenue and Taxation Committee sent to the full House a bill making sweeping changes in school financing.  
The bill from Rep. Frank Bruncel, R-Lewiston, would increase the state sales tax by 1/4 cents, generating about \$150 million per year, to eliminate local



property taxes for school maintenance and operation.  
But the House tax panel on Thursday rejected related legislation from Schools Superintendent Anne Fox.

She proposed increasing the sales tax by one-half percent, generating about \$57 million per year. She wanted to put that into a special fund for school buildings.

That bill would have given the Boise School District \$5.8 million per year and fast-growing Meridian \$4.2 million per year.

Committee members said it was too late in the session to introduce Fox's plan. Thursday was the 46th day of the 1996 session, and Chairman Steve Antone asked Fox why she waited so long to seek introduction of a bill that was under discussion before the session started.

Fox said she spent a lot of time talking to legislators before preparing the bill.  
"It's too late, in my opinion," said Rep. Celia Gould, R-Buhl. She said she preferred to see what

happens to Bruncel's bill.  
Also voted down was legislation introduced early in the session by House Speaker Michael Simpson to divert 2.5 percent of state sales tax revenue into public school construction.

That would give school districts about \$16 million per year.  
A motion to send the bill to the full House failed 10-5 and the committee voted to hold it 10 days. That essentially is a killing motion this late in the session.

Earlier, the Education Committee voted against consideration of two other bills from Simpson that would divert larger amounts into school construction.

## Budget writers bear down, kill Batt plan for more cops

BOISE (AP) — Legislative budget writers continued to bear down on state spending Thursday, slashing over \$600,000 in general tax support from state law enforcement operations.

Among the casualties were two of the three state troopers Gov. Phil Batt wanted, as well as two of the three extra drug investigators for the Department of Law Enforcement's police services division.  
The extra manpower was rejected by a bloc of lawmakers that has taken hard law and order stands when money was not directly involved.  
The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee also refused to use limited general tax revenue to replace

federal money that has been funneled to the state from forfeitures of drug money and material that have been legally challenged.

"I think we were instructed to save where we can as we finish our budgeting process," Republican Rep. Bob Geddes of Preston said.

With less than 7 percent of the general tax budget still to be set, the committee is right on the mark of matching expenditures with revenue if it follows Batt's remaining recommendations — and assuming the revenue estimate is not overly optimistic.

But the unknown part of the equation is what lawmakers do with various tax cuts that have been circulating through the Capitol.

A third home defeat to Utah Valley last week has put the Eagles back in a pressure cooker to get into the two-three lower regional bracket which is supposed to mean less competition until the finals.

But the men don't have it easy. They will be at Dixie College tonight and the Rebels already hold a road win over CSI Saturday, the two Eagle teams move to Ephraim to play Snow College and then wind up next week at Treasure Valley.

"Dixie's first five is probably the most athletic team in the conference," said CSI coach Steve Irons. "Utah Valley and North Idaho are the deepest. But with the addition of the 'Footie (Keon Clark) inside, Dixie has the best starting athletes."

Clark and Kevin Simpson, maybe the league's premier player, give Dixie a

strong 1-2 wing-inside punch. It was a pick-and-roll situation off sidcourt that led Dixie to the comeback win in Twin Falls earlier this year.

JEROME — So much for the law of percentages.

It was the fifth time this season Shoshone and Carey had squared off on the basketball court. (Eight if you count last summer's various camps.)

Shoshone had won the previous four (or seven) and this time the automatic berth into the state Class A-4 state playoffs was on the line. Shoshone captured it after mounting an 18-point lead and withstanding a furious Carey onslaught, 65-55, Thursday night.

It wasn't a death knell, however, for the Panthers. They can pick up their bid by beating Wilder or Cambridge in a one-game playoff at 2:45 p.m. Saturday in Mountain Home.

Shoshone, the fourth district runner-up, will play the 3:30 p.m. game when the state opens at Idaho Falls' Hillcrest High School Feb. 28. The other local entry, Oakley, will play top-ranked Nampa Christian in the 8 p.m. game.

A flurry of turnovers — six in four minutes — let Shoshone break a tight game into a 48-31 lead a minute into the last period.

Carey, which had dug itself into double-digit-deep holes three times (Camas County, Carey and Murtaugh) and escaped with its full-court press, turned on its pressure again in the next three minutes and 41 seconds, the Panthers twice trimmed Shoshone's 18-point lead to five.

But the comeback effort was wearing — as were the intentional fouls. The Indians, behind strong Brian Ross, were pulling away again at the end.

"I felt we did get a little tired toward the end," said Carey coach Lee Cook. "It's tough trying to get back into a game by fouling and the other team is hitting 18-24. And then we were just a little too

was "cordial, a useful exchange of information."

"At no time during that meeting were there any threats made to Mr. Behring by the commissioner," Elias said. "Both sides agreed to reflect on the Seattle stadium (Kingdome) situation and confer later."

Elias said Behring continues to move forward in Southern California with his plan to move to the greater Los Angeles area for the 1996 season with team headquarters at Rams Park in Anaheim, the practice facility for the Los Angeles Rams before their move to St. Louis last year.

Elias said discussions on using the practice facility — and home-field arrangements for the 1996 season — are not yet complete. But he said the team that will have a new name and uniforms in Southern California is planning to use Rams Park for an off-season mini-camp during March.

NFL spokesman Greg Aiello confirmed that Tagliabue and Behring had met in West Palm Beach, Fla., to discuss the franchise.

Aiello told The Associated Press by telephone from New York that the meeting included the commissioner, Behring and team president Dave Behring, the owner's son. The league's finance committee is meeting in West Palm Beach.

## Why Johnny can't pitch like he used to

Common sense scored a rare victory earlier this week when a judge threw out a lawsuit against Johnny Lupoli.

Never mind that Johnny is just 9 years old. What's really worth applauding is that he won't have to part with one penny of his own money, even though he's guilty of the very thing the lawsuit charged: While warming up on the sidelines for a Little League game last May, Johnny lost control of one of his fastballs.

As it turned out, the hummer caught Carl LaRosa, the mother of one of his team-

mates, flush in the face. She needed 60 stitches to close the wound. This being the '90s, and there no longer being any such thing as an accident, LaRosa decided what she needed next was a lawyer.

And not just any lawyer, but a lawyer who would sue a kid for a wild warmup toss without cracking up in front of a judge. He wasn't as hard to find as you might think. Not only that, he came up with a way for LaRosa's husband, Thomas, to get involved. Besides blaming Johnny for being careless, and seeking at least \$15,000 for

LaRosa's pain and suffering, the suit asked even more damages for loss of consortium.

"I think the whole thing has traumatized Johnny to some degree," said his mother, Susan Lupoli, a bookkeeper in Wallingford, Conn.

She said the phone has not stopped ringing at work or at home since Tuesday, when Superior Court Judge Ronald Frazzese dismissed the suit.

"All the support has been wonderful and all I think he understands what he was doing was what any kid who plays baseball might do. And he understands he doesn't have to go to court and all."

"But he still feels embarrassed, like he

did something terribly wrong. And believe me," she added a moment later, "it was my husband and I could do to get him to sign up for Little League again this season."

The only good news to come out of this episode so far is that the LaRosas are 0-1 in court. But not for the obvious reasons. Not because anyone who wanders into a cluster of 9-year-olds throwing a baseball around should know that getting hit is a real possibility.

No, the LaRosas lost because Johnny had a better lawyer. Todd Bainer convinced Frazzese that since the state doesn't allow a child to be the only plaintiff in a lawsuit,

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Steve Elkington, who won the PGA Championship at Riviera Country Club six months ago, continued his mastery of the storied course Thursday, shooting a 4-under-par 67 to share the Nissan Open first-round lead.

Also in a three-way tie at the top was Craig Stadler, who still managed a 67 after a frantic trip to a lost and found didn't turn up his missing putter.

Bert Wrenn, who was off the PGA Tour in 1995 and had to attend qualifying school to make it this year, also shot a 67.

Corey Pavin, attempting to win the tournament for an unprecedented third straight year, shot a 71. Chip Beck, who won at Riviera in 1988, had a 68, joining Scott Simpson and David Tom's a shot behind the leaders.

Fred Couples, the tournament champion in 1990 and 1992 and runner-up in 1993 and 1994, was in a group two strokes off the pace. Also at 69 were two-time champion Lanny Wadkins, Steve Stricker and Kirk Triplett.

Although heavy rains had drenched Riviera for three days, there was sunshine Thursday and the course was in relatively good shape. Even the greens, which had been rebuilt and were brown and pock-marked during the PGA, were fine for the opening round of the tournament.

Stiff winds in the afternoon, however, made the course tricky. "The greens are good, much better now. For all the weather, the course is playing pretty good," said Elkington, a native of Australia who rolled in a 25-foot birdie putt on the first playoff hole to beat Colin Montgomerie for the PGA Championship last August.

HONOLULU (AP) — Despite a stiff breeze blowing over the course, Sherri Turner and Vicki Goetz managed 2-under-par 34s Thursday through the first nine holes of the Hawaiian Ladies Open.

Turner, starting on the back 9 of the 6,069-yard Kapaloe Golf Course, played the first six holes in par before turning in consecutive birdies at the

155-yard 16th and 379-yard 17th. Goetz got to the turn with an up-and-down front nine. She opened with a birdie on the first hole, bogeyed the second and closed out with birdies at the eighth and ninth.

Julie Ingleter took the early lead with birdies on the fourth and fifth holes, but a bogey at the eighth dropped her one stroke behind the co-

leaders at the turn. Also at 1-under through nine were Mizzi Edge and Pearl Sinn, who made the tournament through a qualifying event.

The five were the only early starters in the 144-player field to play sub-par golf midway through the round. With scores hitting the 35-mph mark, gusts soared with the early finishers posting high 70s to low 80s.

## Rockies shift players in outfield positions

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Larry Walker snatched over to Dante Bichette along the right field line and mockingly introduced himself. "I'm Larry Walker. How ya doin'?"

"Hey, Larry. Good to have you," Bichette said, going along with the joke.

Truth is, Bichette and Walker know each other well after patrolling opposite sides of the outfield last year for the Colorado Rockies. And now, thanks to Walker, Bichette is moving back to his old position in right field.

Walker, a two-time Gold Glove right fielder, has agreed to start the spring in center, while Bichette goes to left field after a season in left. Ellis Burks, who won a Gold Glove in center in 1990, will move to left field.

For now, the experiment apparently hinges on Walker. If he's not comfortable with his new position, he earlier said he was "lost" for two innings in center against Los Angeles last year — Walker can request a transfer.

"I know it's for the good of the team as far as helping Dante out and for helping Ellis out," Walker said. "I don't know if it's for the good of the team helping me out, though. I might kill the team."

"I might boot it around more than Dante and Ellis would in their positions. I don't know what's going to happen or how I'm going to play, or how good I'm going to be or how (bad) I'm going to be."

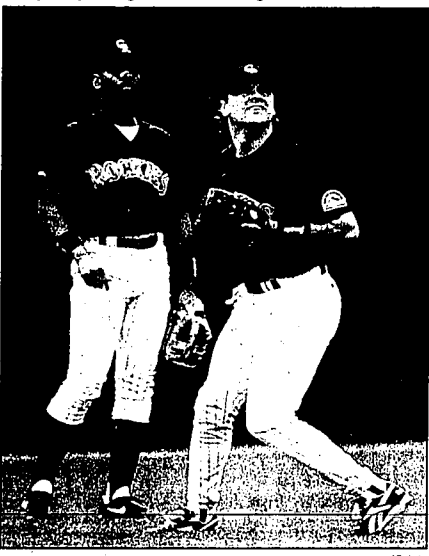
Walker said he will give center field a chance for at least three weeks, but Rockies general manager Bob Gebhard said that is not enough time for Walker to make an informed decision.

"With Larry Walker, he's such an outstanding athlete, he's got all the physical tools to play all three spots," Gebhard said. "He's going to have his difficulties, but I think he'll overcome that without a problem."

"We've talked about the pros and cons of doing this, and I think it's a good idea."

Burks is fine with the idea, saying he'll play wherever the team wants him to play, while Bichette is the person most likely to be rooting for Walker to adjust quickly to center field.

A career right fielder, Bichette moved to left last year after Colorado signed Walker to a five-year contract. Bichette later signed a one-year deal and his only playing was to play left field, where he showed improvement during the season but still was heavily criticized.

## Police stop 'suspicious' Justice

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — David Justice said that when police pulled him over in a high-crime area, his first thoughts were of Rodney King.

The Atlanta Braves outfielder denied any wrongdoing, and police in Riviera Beach, just north of West Palm Beach, filed no charges after the Sunday night incident. Still, the revelation Thursday shook up what figured to be a peaceful spring for the world champion Braves.

"I eats at me because I know I'm a good person," said Justice, whose home run gave the Braves a 3-2 win over Cleveland in the deciding game of the 1995 World Series.

Justice, who is black, wouldn't say his encounter with police was racially motivated. But he said the white officer who made the stop treated him as an adversary.

thing you're saying," Justice said, adding that he was relieved when three other officers, including two blacks, arrived on the scene. Justice said he even signed autographs for one of them.

Justice was pulled over after police spotted his Lexus, its lights off, parked along a busy highway about 3:35 p.m. Sunday, the day before position players reported to spring training at West Palm Beach.

"There was an unknown black male leaning into his vehicle," acting police Lt. David Torres said. "When the officer pulled up, the black male had fled. Justice was later stopped, and the officer conducting the investigation asked what he was doing. It appeared to be suspicious. That's a high-crime area."

Justice said he stopped his car for less than a minute to get his bearings and he denied talking to anyone.

## There are right, wrong ways to get data ready for return time

Every year, you do it and promise that next year will be different. And then you take the annual walk into the tax preparer's office unprepared.

Maybe you aren't as bad as the couple carrying the shopping bag of receipts or the man fumbling through his wallet for his son's Social Security number, but you could probably use a reminder course on how to make a productive visit to the tax wizz.

The basic information that you must take are W-2 forms, 1099 (dividend and interest) forms, a copy of last year's return, mortgage forms and other information, such as unemployment compensation or disability payments.

You also should carry information on rental activities for properties you own and any investment information.

"I like to visually see the information, so I tell clients to bring the actual forms instead of writing it down on a piece of paper," said Guy Sileo, owner of Sileo & Co. Inc., a tax-preparation firm in Brookhaven, Ga.

Once you get to the office, be prepared to answer questions about how the income was derived and about your banking habits, said Lin Thomas, a partner at Professional Tax and Financial Associates Inc. in Philadelphia.

A big part of itemized tax forms and shoeboxes everywhere — is

job- and business-related expenses. But don't worry about fitting the receipts into your car.

"We don't need receipts for every single expenditure, but at least a diary," Thomas said. "The receipts are only necessary in case you get audited."

If you are unsure about something, take it with you or call ahead, said James Brophy, a public accountant with Professional Consultant Service in Northeast Philadelphia.

Social Security cards also are important items to carry. Because of fraudulent dependent claims, some preparers require a copy of your children's cards with their names printed on them. For those planning on filing electronically, the cards are required.

### Micron kills line of computers

**BOISE** — A Micron Technology Inc. subsidiary has decided to discontinue its poorly rated lines of Zeos personal computers less than a year after merging with Minneapolis-based Zeos International Ltd.

"It means Micron didn't do especially well in the acquisition," David Courney, editor of P.C. Letter, an industry newsletter, said Wednesday. "You have to wonder at this point, what did they get? They ended up screwing up a brand name and now have to get rid of it."

But Micron Electronics Inc. spokesman Steve Laney maintains the merger was successful in uniting three small companies into a stronger, publicly traded company with more purchasing power.

"We gained a lot of expertise within the Zeos organization," he said.

### Andrus named to KeyCorp board

**BOISE** — Former Idaho Gov. Cecil Andrus has been elected to the board of directors of Cleveland-based KeyCorp, one of the nation's largest bank holding companies.

"We're really pleased to have someone like Cecil Andrus who knows the Intermountain region," Mike Money, chief executive officer of Key Bank of Idaho, said Tuesday. "Andrus was chosen because of his ability to cross business lines and his political experience," Moon said.

"Idaho is a very important region for KeyCorp, and we want Andrus to be our voice there," spokesman Bill Murschel said.

locity. Then he built a telescope and proclaimed that there were 11 planets, not the holy number seven, and that the planets revolved around the sun, not the sun around the Earth. The Roman Catholic world of 1609 was not ready to change everything based on this upstart's theories. The notion of a moving Earth and stationary sun goes against biblical teachings, the church proclaimed. Church scholars had already named seven days of the week after each of the seven planets. They couldn't just up and have 11 days of the week. Galileo had to go. Or his beliefs did. "They (those new planets) don't exist, Galileo," a church official tells him in the play. "Even if they do—they don't."

Steel saw a production of "Lamp at Midnight," written by Barry Stavis, at Brigham Young University about 25 years ago, and has wanted to direct it ever since. Fortunately, CSI students taking part in the production like it too.

"It's thought-provoking," Steel said. "It allows them to get into emotional discussions on freedom of thought, discovery, religion and beliefs."

"It helps us think how insensitive we are about others' feelings," Steel continued. "It's a good lesson in tolerance and acceptance of others, open to new viewpoints. I think we have a real need in this world to be accepting of our neighbors. Different is often frightening."

Church officials of Galileo's day were so afraid of new learning that they accused him of heresy and warned him to "Obey the church and abandon your opinions."

Under threat of torture, Galileo was finally forced to renounce his belief in the model of the solar system proposed by Nicolas Copernicus, and to assert that the earth stands still with the sun revolving around it. A famous legend holds that Galileo, after making this public declaration about a motionless earth,

muttered, "Nevertheless, it does move."

He was sentenced to life in prison by the Holy Office, but was kept under house arrest until his death at the age of 78.

"Lamp at Midnight," will be shown in Room 119 at CSI's Fine Arts Building. Technology takes Galileo's story from his home to the cathedral and stops along the way via computer-generated stars, stained glass windows and sun streaming through paneled skylights.

Karl Nordstrom plays Galileo. Other cast members are Jessie Hamilton, Brock Durham, Neil S. Taylor, Richard M. Wilson, Bradley Campbell, Scott Smith, Eric Parrott, T.C. Wallace. It's enjoyable for the first two hours or so as a medieval hiss-the-British Western, but it goes into battle overkill. Nominated for 10 Academy Awards. (R, for medieval warfare.) (*Twin Cinema*)

"Bridges of Madison County" — Clint Eastwood's exquisite film version of Robert James Waller's best-seller is rooted in realistic detail and honest human reactions. Although deliberately paced, its emotional approach is forged with directness and economy. And Meryl Streep and Eastwood, playing lovers old enough to be grateful for the rekindling of that emotion, embody a sensuousness that eludes most of their younger peers. (*Liberty Theater of Haley*)

"Before And After" — Barbet Schroeder-directs-Meryl-Streep-and-Liam-Neeson in this film — inspired by Rosellen Brown's novel — in which a couple are thrown-for an spin when their son is charged with murder. (PG-13, for some disturbing images of violence; brief-strong language and some sensuality.) (*Ski Time 4 Cinemas of Ketchum*)

"Black Sheep" — While not as funny as Chris Farley and David Spade's first comedy, "Tommy Boy," it's a high-energy crowd-pleaser directed with plenty of pizzazz by Penelope Spheeris. Farley is a wild man, and Spade is a mad scientist threatening to demolish the gubernatorial campaign of his brother (Tim Matheson); Spade has the impossible job of keeping the big guy in line. With Christine Ebersole and Gary Busey. (PG-13, for crude language and humor, drug-related material and sexual innuendo.) (*Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley*)

"Braveheart" — Mel Gibson directed and stars in this most-three-hour epic about 13th century Scottish freedom fighter William Wallace. (R, for strong action violence and language.) (*Twin Cinema, Ski Time 4 Cinemas of Ketchum, Ace Theater of Wendell*)

"The Crow" — This movie, starring the late Brandon Lee, is like one long fight night. It's almost unrelentingly gritty and overwrought — "Blade Runner" with a hangover — with an ear-drum-blasting industrial rock score to go with its eyeball-popping industrial rock look. (*Liberty Theater of Haley*)

"Dead Man Walking" — Beautifully acted by Sean Penn as a convicted murderer and Susan Sarandon as the nun who visits him on Death Row, this surprising film, written and directed by Tim Robbins. Nominated for four Academy Awards. (R, for a rape and murder.) (*Jerome Cinema*)

"Gold Diggers: The Secret of Bear Mountain" — This is formula family entertainment with girls taking the adventurous leads in a genre that boys usually own. They search for long-lost gold, but the real treasure here is Christina Ricci. (*Twin Cinema*)

"Happy Gilmore" — In the title role, Adam Sandler plays a volatile ice hockey wannabe whose true gifts lie in golf. This mainstream comedy, however, doesn't really deal with Happy's dangerous capacity for violence sufficiently for it to be as funny as it needs to be. There's no doubting Sandler's manic presence, however, and he has splendid support from Christopher McDonald, Carl Weathers and others. (PG-13, for language and comic sexuality.) (*Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley, Ace Theater of Wendell, Ski Time 4 Cinemas of Ketchum*)

"Heat" — What's old has been made fine and new in "Heat." Writer-director Michael Mann and a superlative cast have taken a classic heist movie rife with familiar genre elements and turned it into a sleek, accomplished piece of work, meticulously controlled and completely involving. The dark end of the street doesn't get much more inviting than this. With Robert DeNiro and Al Pacino. (*Liberty Theater of Haley*)

"The Juror" — A torpid psychological thriller, muddled, miscos-

ceived and uninvolved, about the terror that visits jury member Demi Moore in the form of demented mobster Alce Baldwin. Not a tale crying out to be told. (R, violence, language and sexuality.) (*Gooding Cinema*)

"Mary Reilly" — An inert retelling of the Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde story from the point of view of the good doctor's servant girl, played by Julia Roberts, who must have been delighted to come across a role that demanded she be glummer than Bob Dole. Others are likely to feel less cause for celebration. (R, for notable gore and some strong violence.) (*Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley, Ski Time 4 Cinemas of Ketchum*)

"Muppet Treasure Island" — This adroit mix of Muppets and humans in yet another retelling of the classic Robert Louis Stevenson tale is a wonderful picture for children, a work of considerable artistry and craftsmanship that ought to please many adults as well — provided they're able to be absorbed by a highly familiar, very simple story. Tim Curry plays Long John Silver with a twinkle in his eye. (Rated G.) (*Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley*)

"Powder" — This is the best kind of bad movie — an unusual, compelling idea that just doesn't quite work. The title character is an albino teenager with awesome, frightening powers. Early in the movie he pulls a Uri Geller, mind-melding a cafeteria full of cutlery into a towering sculpture of flatware. By the end, he's summoning lightning and transmitting energy fields into dying animals and people. (*Burley Theater*)

"Rumble In The Bronx" — Asian superstar Jackie Chan, a baby-faced battler and flesh-and-blood special effect, has a good chance of crossing over into the American market with this strictly combative action movie, which adds a dose of sentimental fun to Chan's remarkable athletic feats. (R, for some language and violent sequences.) (*Twin Cinema*)

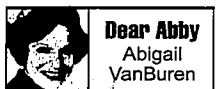
"See And Send" — With Hugh Grant and Emma Thompson (who also did the script) setting the tone, this Ang Lee-directed costume romance is an undemanding, audience-friendly version of Jane Austen, easy-going and sure to please. "Toy Story" — The visuals are impressive, but the major surprise is how much cleverness has been invested in this story of toys in conflict for a small boy's affections. Great voices help, starting with Tom Hanks and Tim Allen as the playthings in question. (G.) (*Twin Cinema*)

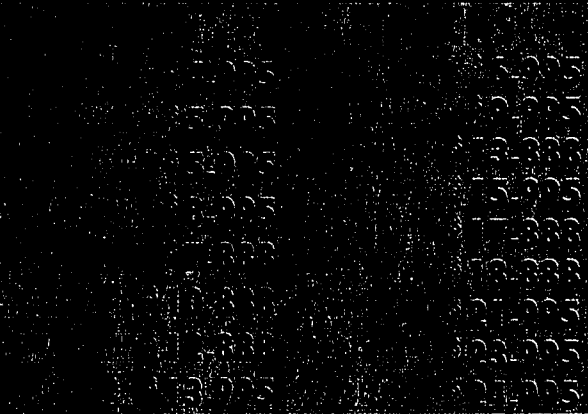

# THE ACES ON BRIDGE

"A trick for a trick" intoned a thoughtless South as he overruled with his trump queen. North added his own comments after the game was done. "Make any more trumps like the one you made in trumps and we'd better stick to playing partners," he advised.

Dummy's club ace won and South played three rounds of hearts, intending to discard his losing club. After this vital discard he could survive a bad trump break, losing two trumps and a diamond. Unfortunately, East ruffed the third heart with his 10 and South overruled. Now he could no longer make his game. West's A-J of trumps produced two defensive tricks. An additional loser in each minor sent the game one down.

South's play of hearts before touching trumps was not a bad plan. Had West held a third trump, playing trumps before hearts would have led to a certain one down.

South's mistake was in abandoning his plan to discard his losing club. When East produces his surprise ruff in hearts, South should discard his club instead of overruffing. The discard would gain nothing had West held A-J-6 in trumps. But then, South could never make the game anyway.

After South discards his losing club, he can hold his losses to one trump, a heart ruff and a diamond and he scores his game and rubber.

## David Letterman berates HBO's new movie

A week before its premiere, David Letterman keeps blasting a Home Box Office movie about the late-night TV wars.

"The clips I saw were just so discouraging," Letterman said Wednesday night of HBO's "The Late Shift," starring John Michael Higgins as Letterman and Daniel Craig as Jay Leno. "Either the guy's playing me as a circus chimp on methadone, or he's playing me exactly as I am. If he's got me right on the money, that's it, pack the bags, goodnight everybody."

During a telephone interview to promote his latest prime-time special on CBS, Letterman derided the HBO movie, which debuts Feb. 24.

"The guy playing me has got RED hair. I'm thinking: What, there's no video tape of me available? We've done 2,000 shows," he said sarcastically. "There's one scene that supposedly shows me relaxing at home on the weekend, wearing a SWEATER and throwing softballs at an archery target. It's like 'Dave's a little simple, here's a little game he invented.'"

"The film 'is the single biggest waste of film since my wedding photos," said the divorced Letterman. "Maybe I could understand it if Jay and I were both dead."

The CBS special (at 10 p.m. Monday) suggests Letterman is very much alive and kicking, despite Leno having overtaken him in the ratings. The hour showcases the funniest bits from CBS' "Late Show" for the past two years.

Letterman's prankish, schoolboy sense of humor and subversive use of television as a medium shines in such bits as bandleader Paul Shaffer's music video about a real-life deli meat-slicer and semi-regular Rupert Jeo's "Candid Camera from hell" segments.

During these bits, an unseen Letterman, equipped with a walkie-talkie and a hidden camera, dictates Jeo to order "a five-pounder" from McDonald's, ask a salesman for a mattress space, 2,000 feet of sleeping space, and bedevil patrons at a cafe by pretending to be a waiter. The real people's unsuspecting reac-

tions are hilarious.

Letterman's favorite segment is a documentary taping to be a "Late Show" guest — rehearsing how to laugh and pick up a coffee cup. Although Martin had two plays in production or opening in New York at the time, he came to Letterman's studio at the Ed Sullivan Theater several times to perfect the spoof.

"I'm so pleased with the results," Letterman said. "Things like that still give you hope for show business."

The former Indianapolis local-TV weatherman could be granted a little pessimism these days. After moving from 12:35 a.m. on NBC to 11:35 p.m. on CBS over two years ago, he has watched his ratings dominance slip away and Leno's "The Tonight Show" regularly beat him in household ratings nationally. (In his hometown of Indianapolis, Letterman still has a handy lead.)

CBS research shows Letterman still winning the desirable younger demographics that advertisers crave. (Sixty-two percent of college-age viewers, for instance, pick Letterman over Leno.)

He blames the "Late Show" slump on CBS' weakness in prime time; a revitalized Leno doing more comedy (including the remotes that Letterman is known for); the resurgence of ABC's "Nightline," thanks to such new events as the O.J. Simpson trial and the Oklahoma City bombing; and the three-month absence last year of head writer Rob O'Donnell, who left to produce Bonnie Hunt's CBS sitcom from Letterman's company, Worldwide Pants.

O'Donnell's absence, "it was difficult for us to establish a different rhythm and fill in the weak spots,"

he said.

"A year ago September, we started to see what was happening, and it was agonizing to realize this was not something that can be fixed right away," he said. "I've been doing this 15 years, and I've been through at least 15 slumps. It's just human nature."

Letterman also explained

why guests and audience members keep complaining his studio is too cold.

"Those pinheads at CBS just yanked the heating system to save money," he joked. "Now we've just got a couple of Coleman camp stoves. A couple of nights I came back to my office and had to be treated for hypothermia."

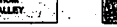

## Ted Turner to add sports network

Hoping to do in the sports arena what he's done in the news arena, Ted Turner, partnered with Time Warner, will launch a 24-hour sports-news service to be called CNN/SI.

The channel, scheduled to start in December, will combine the news-gathering resources of CNN with those of the Time Warner-owned Sports Illustrated magazine. It's the first major venture between the two parent companies since last year's announcement that they would merge (a move that is actually still pending).

The new venture will report on sports only, and won't telecast sporting events. "Anytime of the day when a sports fan will want to know what's going on, they can turn to CNN/SI," said Steven Robinson, senior editor of Sports Illustrated. The new service, he added, will "not only be sports and highlights, but depth and perspective and analysis."

CNN Sports President Jim Walton said research indicates there's a niche for 24-hour sports news. And despite the existence of NewSport - a similar service - one is doing what CNN/SI has planned, Walton said.

"We don't want to put anybody down," Walton said. "But Turner Broadcasting has more experience."

Josh Sapan, president of Rainbow Programming Holdings, parent of NewSport, said the company welcomed the new challenge. "NewSport, having established this television category, is well positioned against any new entrant into the market." ...

Norman Korpi, the openly gay roommate from the "Real World's" first season, denied com-

ments in a story here last week that he has tried to exploit a past relationship with former TV talk-show host Charles Perez.

In "The Real World Reunion Special" which debuted on MTV Saturday, producers used clips of Korpi and Perez together in illustrating Korpi's open homosexuality. The New York Daily News story focused on MTV's decision to include Perez, who has become a TV personality since his 1992 "Real World" appearances, in the special.

Korpi says the footage is a matter of record that can't be changed.

He also clarified that the clips in question were taped at a pro-choice rally in Washington, D.C. An MTV spokesperson told the Daily News last week that the footage was taped at a gay rights rally.
