The Tennessee Senate is considering legislation to fire any teacher who presents evolution as

studening legislation to the any teacher who presents evolution as fact. The bill was expected to pass during Monday night's session but instead was sent back to commi-tee for study-of six proposed amendments.



ties.
Initial hantavirus symptoms in-clude high fever, headache, malaise, cough, abdominal or low-er back-pain, nausea and vomiting. Those symptoms are followed by respiratory distress and low blood

respiratory distress and low officer pressure.

The virus is spread through the urine, saliva, droppings and nest-ing materials of infected wild ro-dents or chipmunks. Rodents can have hantavirus without showing signs of being sick.

"Usually house mice are not the problem," Becker said. "We just tell people that if you have ro-dents, then you should take pre-cautions."

Infection usually occurs when people distrutb areas with contami-naterials, which then get into the amount of the piccar of the con-car of the contaminate of the con-cent bites or if dried rodent drop-pings contaminate broken skin.

"When you look at 60 years of ever-increasing centralized government, we've taken a significant first step in rolling it back," he said. "Have we succeided in completing the revolution? Of course not!"







It's aimed at keeping long-time residents beset by skyrockering property taxes in their homes. The bill passed 57-12 and will next go to Gov. Phil Bant to be signed. Some lawmakers argued against the bill because it doesn't make heirs responsible for back taxes, doesn't consider the assets of the resident in question and passes the property tax burden on to other residents.

-TWIN FALLS - Twin Falls will speed up the destruction of vicious dogs to protect the public, the City Council decided Monday night.

Under previous code, a dog that affacts someone must be impounded for 10 days for nipies checks, then released to its owner until a court finds the owner.



Stocks returning to more typical levels of volatility

NEW YORK — Fasten your Quotron. The recent volatility in stocks has led some investors to wonder whether their quote machines have gone kaflosey. They haven't Stocks — especially high-rome. will refer on intradey basis late by, with the Dow Jones industrials swinging as much as 100 points on three different days in the last two weeks. "Volatility in general has been on the rise," said Greg Nie, Senior vice president for technical research at Everen Securities in Chicago. Ancedotal evidence is that the swings have been substantial lately. The Chicago Board of Options Exchange's market volatility index, which measures traders' expectations of, market volatility, rose to a weekly high



of 19.34 this past Thursday from 16.80 on Feb. 16. The index closed the week at 17.96, up from 10.56 on Dec. 4. For the most part, investors have

taken the market's volatility in stride. Analysts are quick to point out that volatility on a percentage basis is not that high.

Compared to the Dovés record high closing level of 5,630.49 on Feb. 23, a 100-point move represents less than 1.8 percent. That is dwarfed by the intraday moves of 10 percent or more that were regular in late 1987.

The market only looks jumpy now only because it has had a relative lack of volatility for several years, said Tony Spare, Charlman 105 Spare, Kaplan, Bischel & Associates in Sun Francisco.

"All that were going to do is just have a return to normal from very abnormal conditions."

conditions."

The market typically gets more volatile when it is about to end a major move, either up or down, said Bernard Schaeffer, president of Investment

Research Institute Inc. in Cincinnati.

"We don't happen to believe that we're putting in anything like the ultimate topping of the market," Schaeffer said. "But clearly, we have taken on additional yolatility over the last few weeks," which Schaeffer believes is tied to the recent rise in interest rates.



Short of that, Foster said he hopes to draw the attention of a professional team willing to take him on and pay for his equipment, training and expenses.



The tour, officially called the Fresca Points Series, is Foster's best chance to prove he belongs on one of the well-tunded pro teams.
