# Minidoka prosecutor wants judge to step aside

RUPERT — Alleging 5th District Judge William Hart had external contact with a representative of the attorney general's office, Minidoka County Prosecutor Gara Newman says she doesn't want him deciding who should prosecute three pending murder cases.

Newman petitioned the court Wednesday, asking that Hart be disqualified from the three Minidoka County cases before a Monday morning hearing. A request by the county commissioners to have the Idaho attorney general's office take over the prosecution of Corey Hood, Jesus Diaz and Kody Butcher — in connection with three slayings — is scheduled to be discussed in court Monday.

Newman has been wrangling with Attorney General Alan Lance over control of the three cases since the attorney general said his office was taking them over nearly two weeks ago.

Tuesday, the Idaho Supreme Court delayed ruling on who should have jurisdiction over the cases until Hart decides whether to grant the request from the Minidoka County Commissioners.

In motions filed Wednesday, Newman said Hart has engaged in outside contact with Scott James, a deputy attorney general. James was served with a subpoena Thursday and probably will be called to testify about his contacts with Hart.

In an affidavit, James said he spoke with Hart but "at no time did Judge Hart

and I discuss the merits of any of the three cases."

Newman also referred to an Idaho Criminal Rule that allows judges to be disqualified if they have "been counsel for any party in the action or proceeding" or are "biased or prejudiced for or against any party" in her motion to remove Hart.

Judge Hart is out of town and may not be available to rule on her requests until Monday morning. Newman is asking the matter be heard at 9 a.m. on Monday.

"You get a fairer decision for all parties" by bringing in a new judge, Minidoka County Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Clayne Zollinger said. "There's been so much press, it's hard for anyone to stay

# Democrat push for Hispanics falls short

RUPERT — Idaho Democrats, on a major push this year to find Hispanic candidates and voters, haven't had much luck in the Magic Valley.

They called people who might be interested in speaking public office. They contacted people who had run before and those in school parent-teacher groups. But even though Minidoka and Cassia counties have two of the highest percentages of Hispanics in the state — 19.3 percent and 13.4 percent, respectively — Democrats came up empty when searching for Hispanics to join their cause.

"We went as far and as deep as we could," said Rob Johnson, director of the party's election campaign. "As far as recruiting candidates, we weren't able to get any."

That's partly because it's tough to crack a staunch Republican area, even with compelling issues, he said.

"It's a very hard sell to get someone to run for those districts over there as a Democrat," he said.

But Raymundo Pena, a Rupert attorney and Democrat who has successfully sought public office in the past, said it may be wrong for his party to assume that the Hispanics in Cassia and Minidoka counties feel an alliance for that party.

"I think historically they have made that assumption," he said. But, "once you feel like you're being taken for granted, you stand up and say, 'well, what's in it for us?'"

MURTAUGH — A passion for horses has taken Zeb Bell from the Wisconsin horse farm where he grew up to Murtaugh and now to the Atlanta Olympics.

Bell's smooth voice has earned him accolades as an announcer for rodeos and other events across the Magic Valley and beyond.

Now almost 30 years later after leaving the farm to command the airwaves of a Minneapolis radio station, Bell will use his vocal talents to earn a spot in Olympic history.

The Olympics are a stage for the world's greatest athletes to perform.

In Atlanta, the American Quarter Horse Association plans to put its finest breeds on display with Bell's commentary as accompaniment to three special demonstrations.

"The focus is to show people the versatility of the American Quarter Horse, which is the largest breed and has the largest breed registry in the world," Bell said.

Bell is a natural choice for the Olympic announcing job.

"There's not another announcer who has done as many world and national events as I have. Twenty years ago, I had no idea I'd be where I am today," Bell said in an interview before packing his bags for Atlanta.

# House passes welfare reform

WASHINGTON — Congress moved toward a fundamental reshaping of the welfare system Thursday, passing legislation to transfer control of welfare programs to states and set time limits and work requirements for recipients.

The House approved its bill 256-170, and the Senate is expected to pass a similar measure early next week.

The big remaining question is whether Congress can produce a bill that will win the approval of President Clinton, who said this week that he wants to sign a welfare bill before the August political conventions.

But House Republicans refused to give him the major changes he was seeking. And on Thursday, GOP lawmakers frustrated key Clinton administration officials by adding restrictions on food stamp benefits for low-income adults who don't have children.

GOP House leaders on the bill were unapologetic, saying that 30 Democrats voted for the measure.

"We have come a long way and we have been reasonable," said Rep. E. Clay Shaw Jr., R-Fla., chairman of the House Human Services Subcommittee.

## Airline security questions arise anew

Despite a Congressional mandate and years of research, U.S. airports remain without a foolproof system to spot elusive plastic explosives capable of blowing a jumbo jet out of the sky.

Other nations, from Great Britain to Korea, use a variety of chemical sniffers and sophisticated X-rays to do the job. But such systems never met the Federal Aviation Administra-

tion's exacting criteria for speed and accuracy. Only recently has a \$900,000 system been approved for further testing — too late to catch what might have been a bomb aboard TWA Flight 800.

"We would all like to have a magic box that would detect explosives, and work effectively and efficiently, but no such device has so far been proven," said Tim Neal, a spokesman for the Air Transport Association, an industry

# White House employee won't answer questions

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Judiciary Committee will go to court if needed to get documents held by the White House worker who gathered FBI background files on hundreds of Reagan and Bush employees, the panel's chairman said Thursday.

In addition, Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, is likely to rule soon on the validity of Anthony Marceca's Fifth Amendment claims, which also could lead to the Senate going to court to compel his testimony.

Hatch said Marceca's constitutionally right not to testify may not apply because he already gave evidence on the FBI files to a House panel.

Hatch asserted that Marceca's right to silence — which at any rate might not apply in this case — does not extend to documents and computer discs sought by the committee. "We will take every step to obtain those documents legally," he said.

With the Clinton administration and Secret Service at odds over the files debacle, Hatch's committee got no answers from Marceca in private questioning Thursday.

Hatch and others said the former temporary White House employee repeatedly refused to answer by asserting his constitutional privilege against incriminating himself. Marceca and his attorneys also refused to surrender documents the panel subpoenaed.

Marceca refused to answer any questions or produce any documents, in an unconditional manner," Hatch told reporters after the hour-long session. He said Marceca was asked over several dozens of questions about his collection of the FBI files and other matters.

Marceca, a civilian Army investigator, asserted the FBI background files while on temporary assignment of the White House early in the Clinton administration. He had twice before invoked the Fifth Amendment before congressional panels.

# President denies jobs tied to political support

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — Summoned for a second time to defend political supporters at a Whitewater trial, President Clinton told jurors in videotaped testimony Thursday that he never gave jobs to two bankers in return for their substantial political support.

"What is not permissible is to promise any official act in return for a contribution," the president, appearing relaxed and confident, testified. "That didn't happen in this case."

The jurors in the federal court trial watched raptly as Clinton's image was projected on a 42-inch monitor during 95 minutes of edited testimony, which was taped at the White House during the four hours of questioning July 2.

Clinton acknowledged that the two defendants, Herby Branscum Jr. and Robert M. Hill, raised money for him and that he owed more than \$100,000 to their rural bank after the 1990 election. The loans were repaid in late 1992.

But the president said he had no "specific recollection" of Dec. 14, 1990 meeting at which Hill and an associate delivered \$15,000 in contributions to Clinton and discussed Branscum's appointment to the powerful State Highway Commission.

A earlier witness testified that Clinton thumbed through the

checks, then brought up the appointment, which was made five weeks later.

Clinton said "it wouldn't surprise me" that he would meticulously go through each check so that he could later sign thank you letters to the donors.

Branscum and Hill, the owners of Perry County Bank, are charged with concealing from the IRS more than \$50,000 in cash withdrawals the Clinton campaign made on the eve of the 1990 primary and general elections for get-out-the-vote activities.

They also are accused of misapplying bank funds by using the bank's money to reimburse themselves and others for political contributions, including checks to Clinton's 1990 campaign and his 1991 presidential exploratory committee.

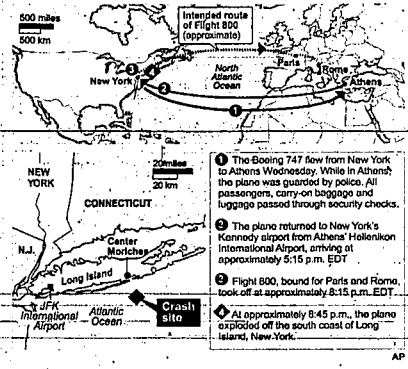

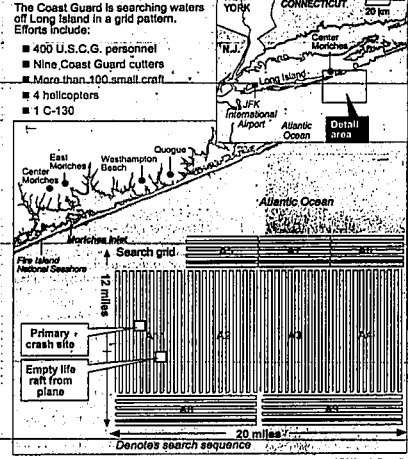

# Small town mourns 21 believed aboard jetliner

MONTOURSVILLE, Pa. (AP) — Students slowly approached the old-fashioned stone high school Thursday, greeting one another with tears, sobs and embraces, their thoughts with the 21 classmates and chaperones aboard TWA Flight 800.

The 16 students, along with a teacher, her husband, a school secretary and two parents, were embarking on a 10-day French Club trip, the culmination of more than two years of bake sales, car washes and penny pinching.

By 4 a.m., their slim hopes were dashed — they were sure the whole group had boarded the plane. By Thursday afternoon, the National Transportation Safety Board told Principal Dan Chandler that 20 of 21 bodies had been recovered.

"These kids are among the best and brightest in this community," said Tim Larson, who knew 10 of the children and coached three on a local swim team. "When you live in a town of 5,000, everybody knows everybody."

Late Wednesday night, as news reports trickled in about the crash, the students' parents gathered at the school, nestled in a residential area which sits on the banks of the Susquehanna River.

Hours later, parents and other family members climbed onto two buses for the trip from central Pennsylvania to New York.

Counselors and clergy met with the parents' before they left, and some even accompanied the group to New York.

"They're in terrible shape," New York Mayor Rudolph Giuliani said after meeting with them at a hotel near Kennedy Airport. "For many of the (children) it was their first time away from home. It's horrible and heartbreaking."

The mayor spent the night in the ballroom of the Ramada Plaza, going from table to table where family groups sat numbly, trying to answer questions and offer comfort.

### Conservation groups sue EPA

WASHINGTON — Three conservation groups sued the Environmental Protection Agency Thursday, accusing it of failing to develop effective programs to control air pollution that leads to poisoned lakes and rivers.

Such pollution includes some of the chemicals most harmful to people and wildlife — such as mercury, lead and dioxins — and their effects are "many and pernicious," said Mark Van Putten, president of the National Wildlife Federation.

The threat to human health includes cancer, kidney and liver poisoning, respiratory problems, nerve damage and nervous system disorders, reproductive illnesses and developmental difficulties, he said.

### Report links raspberries, cyclospora

ATLANTA — Raspberries from Guatemala are the likely suspects for a parasite called cyclospora that has sickened about 1,000 people in the United States and Canada this year, the government said Thursday.

But how and where the single-celled parasite got into the berries still isn't known, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said.

"Whether they got contaminated in Guatemala or on the way here is what we are trying to find out," said Sue Binder of the CDC's National Center for Infectious Diseases.

Cyclospora invades the small intestine and causes diarrhea, vomiting, weight loss, fatigue and muscle aches. It's treatable with antibiotics, but can last several weeks and cause dehydration while symptoms last.

### Connecticut joins tobacco industry suit

HARTFORD, Conn. — Connecticut filed a \$1 billion lawsuit against the tobacco industry Thursday, joining nine other states that are seeking to recover taxes spent treating tobacco-related illnesses.

The lawsuit also is aimed at what state Attorney General Richard Blumenthal called aggressive marketing of tobacco products to youngsters.

"Every year, Connecticut taxpayers spend \$100 million on Medicaid alone to treat the diseases that result from the tobacco industry's relentless effort to addict our residents to their products," Blumenthal said.

### Weapons charge added to long list against Filer man

TWIN FALLS—A Filer man already headed for trial on charges that he shot a law enforcement officer in February now faces a weapons enhancement that could add 15 years to any prison sentence he receives.

Ernest Watts, Jr., 31, is scheduled for trial at 9:30 a.m. Aug. 6 on five felony charges in connection with a seven-hour standoff in which two officers were injured. Filer police Cpl. Michael Orban was shot in both hands, breaking several bones in his left hand and lodging pellets in his right hand, according to police.

Sgt. Kelly Wilson of the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Department was sprayed with glass shards when Watts fired at deputies, according to a police statement in Watts' court file.

Watts is charged with two counts of aggravated battery, two counts of aggravated assault and one count of battery with the intent to commit a serious felony.

### Another range fire ignites land near INEL Thursday

ARCO—Another in a series of range fires burned 1,500 acres near the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory Thursday.

The blaze started at 2:30 p.m. on the south side of U.S. Highway 20 and immediately blew across the road to the north side. No INEL facilities were threatened, according to a Department of Energy statement.

A stretch of the highway was closed for part of the afternoon.

The fire was contained just before 5 p.m. Firefighters continued to monitor hot spots amid strong winds, which were expected to gust up to 35 mph until 11 p.m.

A cause for the fire has not been reported. Earlier in the week, three range fires burned several thousand acres at the site.

Commissioners will set fees for the county landfill at Hub Butte for the budget year 1996-97. The meeting is open to the public.

### Freeway work set to begin next week near Burley

BURLEY—Reconstruction of 14 miles of Interstate 84 from the North Side Canal to the Burley Interchange, will begin next week, the Idaho Transportation Department announced.

During the first week of work, expect some minor lane restrictions as crossovers are built to shift all traffic to the eastbound lanes.

Crews will grind off pavement, mix it with new material, lay it back down and cover it with new pavement. The \$4.4 million project should be completed in October.

### Shareholders' suit filed against hardware chain

SEATTLE—Shareholders have sued Ernst Home Centers, accusing company officials of violating securities laws in a stock offering nearly two years ago that netted Ernst \$45 million.

Ernst filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection last week. The lawsuit, filed Tuesday in federal court in Seattle, alleges the Seattle hardware-and-garden-chain mislead investors about its ability to complete successfully as a hardware superstore.

In seeking bankruptcy protection, Ernst has closed 14 stores, including six in Puget Sound area. It also has 11 other Western states where it does business.

Ernst Vice President Jim Fox said Tuesday it was company policy not to comment on a pending lawsuit.

The suit is on behalf of investors who bought Ernst common stock from Sept. 27, 1994, through Jan. 26, 1996. It alleges Ernst presented a misleading picture of the company's financial position when the stock was offered.

# Pollution prevention goes on tour

TWIN FALLS—Since the dawn of automotive maintenance, one of the biggest questions faced by mechanics has been what to do with used antifreeze, solvents and other nasty liquids.

The most obvious, but least environmentally palatable solution is to dump the gunk down a sink or storm drain. Trouble is, covert dumping turns one person's problem into everyone's problem because the mess, ultimately, must be cleaned up.

Dumping also costs the dumper because much of what goes down the drain is: A) Expensive; and B) Easy to purify and use again.

"Though dumping may seem like the best short-run answer, we've got to live in the long-run," said Eric Traynor.

Traynor was in Twin Falls Thursday, dispensing advice and showing off an array of recycling equipment that travels the state with him in a custom-fitted motor home.

Traynor grew up in Twin Falls and recently graduated from the University of Idaho with a degree in environmental sciences.

These days, he roams the state like an anti-pollution missionary—converting lost souls and spreading the good word about recycling and effective disposal techniques.

He is the point man for a pollution prevention program that was originally pioneered in Iowa. His motor home, furnished by the University of Northern Iowa, is bristling with recycling equipment.

"The idea is to reduce the amount of waste rather than deal with it at the tail end of the pipe," Traynor said. To that end, he leads curious visitors through his motor home like a proud hunter showing off his trophy room.

One of his favorite pieces of equipment is an antifreeze distiller, which boils lathsome old antifreeze until it condenses into water and pure ethylene glycol—leaving behind a small gush of contaminants.

The ethylene glycol can be mixed with anti-rust agents, corrosion inhibitors and green food coloring to produce fresh antifreeze, Traynor said. The result is far less nasty gunk to dispose of and plenty of inexpensive, new antifreeze.

Elsewhere in his motor home, Traynor has a variety of parts-cleaning tanks. The solvent tank has a pair of filters that keep the fluid clean, "and that increases the amount of time that mechanics can use their solvent," he said.

Another cleaning tank uses hot coconut and palm oil to scrub greasy parts, while yet another uses nothing fancier than soap and hot water—just like a dishwasher.

Filteration systems also are available for those don't like to distill their antifreeze, Traynor said.

Finally, a single quart of motor oil can go a long ways toward polluting groundwater, Traynor said; a quart of old oil can turn up to a million gallons of groundwater.

To capture as much oil as possible, Traynor touts an oil filter press that drains filters, then crushes them so there's nowhere for old oil to lurk.

"All this stuff adds up," he said, adding that his goal is to get a few mechanics to follow his advice. Once a few treadsetters see the light, the recycling gospel spreads fast in small communities, he said.

## Lightning: Dangerous weather feature

BURLEY—An estimated 100 people die and 300 are injured each year by lightning in the United States, but experts say most people don't think twice about it until it strikes an area near them.

### Lightning tips

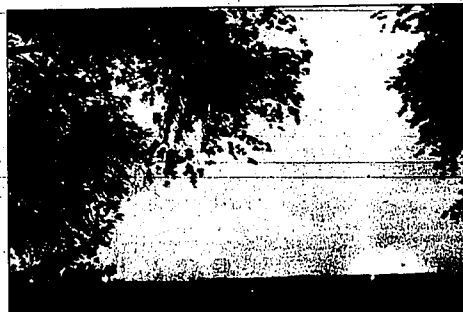
To keep from getting struck precautions to take if you find yourself in a lightning storm or one is approaching include:

- Drop all tools, golf clubs, fishing poles or other metal objects that could potentially attract lightning.
- Avoid rivers, lakes and streams when thunderstorms begin approaching, if traveling in a boat, return to shore immediately and get inside a car or other protected shelter. Also avoid standing under single trees.
- Move away from high ground such as hills or mountains where lightning bolts are most likely to strike.
- Retreat to the lowest ground possible when lightning is imminent. If shelter isn't available, crouch low to the ground but avoid lying flat.

Unfortunatly, that area was a sugar-beet field near Burley Wednesday afternoon, where 28-year-old Misael Sandoval was killed by lightning while hoeing sugar beets with his wife at 500 West 400 South in Cassia County.

"It was very unfortunate what happened to him, but what people don't realize is that this is probably one of the most dangerous weather features we have in southeastern Idaho," said Bruce Bauck, a meteorologist for the National Weather Service in Pocatello.

With its wide, open areas and fairly small population, the Mini-Cassia area isn't the typical terrain where lightning normally strikes. However, it is something people need to be on the lookout

for—especially now, Bauck said.

"Summertime is the most common time for lightning, and you don't have to be under a thunderstorm to be struck since the actual bolt can travel several miles away from the storm itself through the clear air," he said.

Lt. Jim Higns of the Cassia County Sheriff's Department who investigated Sandoval's death, said it wasn't clear where he was struck in the field, or what he was doing at the time, but no further investigation would be conducted.

"His family in Mexico is being notified, but unfortunately there's nothing else we can do," he said. "It was an accident, plain and simple."

Sandoval was taken to Cassia Regional Medical Center after being struck around 3:30 p.m. Efforts to revive him were unsuccessful.

Higns said he can only recall one lightning-related death in Burley in the past 25 years. However, wildfires caused by lightning during summertime have become an annual problem, he said.

Two weeks ago, dry lightning storms sparked at least 8 fires in southern Idaho when temperatures topped 103 degrees. Several range fires in the past two months have also been caused by lightning and are expected to continue during the summer.

"Every year it causes several hundred million dollars in damage to property and land, so people shouldn't assume it's

## Developer eyes new-low income rentals

TWIN FALLS—New rental housing for low-income residents may be on the horizon in Twin Falls, where a shortage of affordable housing has been eased but hasn't disappeared.

People needing subsidized rentals still are lined up on a waiting list, said Kay Rieli, who supervises the busy Twin Falls office of the Idaho Housing and Finance Association, formerly the Idaho Housing Agency.

"The need has not gone away," she said.

But a California-based developer has plans to build 60 new apartments by the northwest corner of Blue Lakes Boulevard South and Park Avenue, said Josh Grant, a manager for Twin Falls Associates. The partnership is connected with Kon-Development Inc. of Oakhurst, Calif.

The new apartments—for now called Rock Creek Vista Apartments—would be two- to four-bedroom units that rent for about half of market value, he said.

The project recently received a \$525,000 low-interest loan under the federal HOME Program, as well as direct federal income tax credits to be sold for funds, said Marnie Anderson, spokesperson for Idaho Housing in Boise.

The amount of Low-income Housing Tax Credit awarded for Rock Creek Vista Apartments wasn't available Thursday, Anderson said.

Before it becomes reality, the project must clear hurdles including applications for a rezoning and building permits. Twin Falls Economic Development Director Dave McAlindin said.

"They're a long way from being done," he said.

But the city's Urban Renewal Agency may help finance construction through its tax-increment financing program, said McAlindin, who contends that Twin Falls "is in desperate need of decent, safe, affordable housing."

Rock Creek Vista Apartments would be the developer's first project in Twin Falls, Grant said. Its projects elsewhere typically include a manager's office with a laundry, and often tennis and basketball courts, a pool or a playground, he said.

Twin Falls Associates also hopes to receive Idaho Housing funds for a proposed 42-unit development on Lois Street, Grant said.

## National Basque meet in Gooding

GOODING—It's the biggest party this farm town has ever thrown, and Gooding Chamber of Commerce isn't about to let folks forget it.

And so many vehicles are anticipated along Gooding's Main Street that the Chamber has hired Trans IV, the Twin Falls-based bus company, to provide park-and-ride service Saturday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Cost is 50 cents a ride.

Representatives of 33 Basque clubs—from as far away as New York—will be in town for the weekend, but the business of the convention will be dispensed with in a members-only meeting Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Gooding City Hall.

At 2 p.m., a parade is planned from City Hall to the Gooding County Fairgrounds, which will be the site of many of the weekend's activities.

Live music entertainment, featuring dance groups from the West, a sheep dog exhibition and demonstrations of traditional Basque sports, is planned from 3 p.m. at the fairgrounds.

At 8 p.m., a dance is scheduled at the National Guard Armory.

In its ninth year, it reveals how trappers, Indians, Oregon Trail pioneers and the cavalry interacted more than 100 years ago. The pageant features 200 cast

members, nearly 200 horses, a dozen covered wagons and a historic cabin. "It attracts about 2,000 viewers and will be performed Saturday at the base of Big Hill, where wagon ruts from the Oregon Trail can still be seen. Rancher Dennis Hunsaker plays Mountain Fawn's husband, Peg Leg Smith, a trapper, trader and self-described horse thief.

# Idaho Air Force sergeant stands out in Saudi blast

MOUNTAIN HOME (AP) — Staff Sgt. Jim Prater denies he's a hero. All he did when terrorists bombed the apartment complex where he was living in Saudi Arabia last month was pop his knee back into its socket, bang one victim's eye into its socket, bandage other victims' wounds with scraps of sheets and help evacuate the building. Then he went on patrol.

Pipes ruptured, flooding living spaces in the dorm-style apartment building. Windows exploded, with glass shards knitting into the walls and causing scores of injuries. Doors blown from their hinges landed on stretchers. One occupant of Prater's building died; another remains in a coma.

He was OK. I pushed my knee back into joint and checked on the guys in the next room, who had minor cuts and bruises. Then I went down a floor and found a guy who was badly cut. I took four of us to get him down six flights of stairs. He lost three pints of blood. There was blood everywhere. ... Two more floors down, I found a woman with her eye hanging out. I pushed it back in and bandaged it up. We used pieces of sheets, shirts, whatever we could find.

"If you weren't there, it sounds like I did a lot," he said. "But it was that way for all of us. Everybody was helping." Prater was among 29 people from Mountain Home Air Force Base on temporary duty at a U.S. military complex near Dhahran when a truck bomb exploded June 25, instantly killing Americans. More than 300 people were injured. "The blast shattered windows in a mall nearly a mile away."

"It wasn't a loud crack like high explosives would have made. It was more like a rumble, the kind made with a lower class of explosives but more earth-moving power. I heard the building next to me crumble and people screaming and crying."

Prater, 28, was sleeping in his seventh-floor room when the bomb exploded at about 10 p.m. The Los Angeles native and Air Force explosive-ordnance technician recognized the sound instantly. "I pushed it back in and bandaged it up. We used pieces of sheets, shirts, whatever we could find. For his efforts, Prater could receive a commendation medal. Like others injured in the bombing, the 10-year veteran also stands to receive a Purple Heart.

## Water measurement districts coming

JEROME - One way or another, the Idaho Department of Water Resources is determined to find out how much water every southern Idaho farmer is using.

To that end, Water Resources is planning to establish a pair of enormous water measurement districts, the larger of the two would stretch from Island Park to Bliss. The districts will encompass farmers who aren't part of a larger entity, such as an irrigation district, that already measures its total use of water.

Officials from Water Resources explained the idea at a series of whistle-stop public hearings across the Magic Valley Thursday. The Jerome hearing was attended by about 20 water users who generally appeared receptive.

"A water measurement district has a very narrow focus," said Gary Spackman, water distribution manager for Water Resources. The idea is to measure and report how much water is used, and to keep tabs on water levels in the Eastern Snake River Plain Aquifer - from which thousands of farmers draw their water.

Ultimately, the goal is to get a handle on supply and demand for southern Idaho's water, Spackman said, because "we've had declining (groundwater) levels in some areas and declines in surface waters in other areas of the state."

Water Resources Director Karl Disher is expected to formally establish the water measurement districts sometime this fall. Comments on the idea will be accepted through July 29, Spackman said.

Each of the measurement districts would employ a hydrographer who would produce a report on water use throughout the district. The hydro-

grapher also would handle the district's financial affairs, including preparation of a budget and billing individual water users to pay for district operations.

Farmers would have the option of installing flow meters on their pumps, or submitting electrical records, which - combined with data about the pump - can reveal how much water was pumped.

Most Magic Valley farmers already measure how much water they use, so the water measurement district would simply standardize the data collection and reporting functions.

## Ketchum mulls affordable housing

KETCHUM - The first housing in Ketchum to break the affordability barrier might be built at the Alpenrose Hotel.

Realtor Tom Heinrich spoke at the community housing commission meeting Tuesday on behalf of Warehouse Development Corp., current owners of the Alpenrose.

According to Heinrich, Warehouse president and part time local resident Rich Robbins wants to include affordable housing in the

re-development of the Alpenrose. "I think (Robbins) is trying to give back to the community in some way. And he's been involved in affordable housing in California where there are incentives that make it attractive," Heinrich said.

The property known as the Alpenrose operated as a Holiday Inn in the mid-seventies. Local developer Norm Fuller bought it, but it sat idle until Warehouse Development bought it earlier this year.

Heinrich said tentative plans for

the property include removal of all of the existing structures except the tennis courts. The new project would be a multi-use village with pool, athletic club, restaurant, retail and office space, underground parking for 200 cars, private residences and, perhaps, affordable community housing. Work on the site could begin this winter.

Commission members were excited by the proposal. "We are very interested in any private sector partnerships" Bryan Furlong said. "One unit or twenty. We'll look at all ideas."

## About the Basques

About 10,000 Idahoans have some Basque heritage, the descendants of several thousand who immigrated to Idaho and elsewhere in the West from Spain, France and Mexico at the end of the 19th century and during the first third of this century.

The roots of the Basque culture and language in the Pyrenees Mountains are ancient; the Basques were there long before the time of the American West.

The most severe repression came during the reign of Spanish dictator Francisco Franco from 1939 to 1974. Franco suspected the Basques, many of whom had fought against Franco in the Spanish Civil War, of disloyalty and suppressed their language and culture. A Basque separatist movement sprung up during the Franco regime, but has gradually subsided as the 20-year-old Spanish democracy has given the Basques greater autonomy over their own affairs.

Grass burning heats up activists

SANDPOINT — A group opposed to grass burning by the blue-grass industry plans to target individual farmers for lawsuits. When farmers start torching some 9,000 acres next month, a meteorologist hired by the Clean Air Coalition will track the plumes of smoke. Other coalition workers on the ground and in two airplanes will document which farmers are burning and where the fires go.

The goal is to help area residents file lawsuits against growers and make grass field burning an expensive legal hassle, said coalition president Art Long. Some North Idaho residents complain that the burning causes health problems and ruins summer days.

Driver pleads innocent to charge

CASCADE — A Smiths Ferry man charged with vehicular manslaughter in the death of a Cascade teen-ager has pleaded innocent to the charge.

A trial for William D. Daugherty, 24, was set for Dec. 16. He was driving his pickup on Idaho 55 south of Smiths Ferry with four passengers on April 12. He apparently swerved to miss an oncoming vehicle and drove off the road into the Payette River. Frederick High School student Michelle Larson drowned. Her body was found a half-mile downstream from the accident.

Trash education team travels Pocatello

POCATELLO — Allison Brody wants to encourage people to think trashy thoughts when they consider what goes into the garbage can.

She and the rest of the Solid Waste Awareness Team are using a mobile exhibit to travel Pocatello-area residents how generating less trash can lower disposal costs. Brody attends Idaho State University and is the driving force behind creation of the exhibit. It is a semi-trailer borrowed from the school and converted into a rolling classroom to educate locals about solid waste.

Utah trooper fires at motorist

SALT LAKE CITY — A Utah Highway Patrol trooper shot once at a drunk driving suspect who allegedly tried to run him down before crashing into a westside home here.

UHP Lt. Verdi White II said the driver, identified as 25-year-old Maximilian Reynolds of Salt Lake, was not hit by the gunshot but was slightly injured in the crash early Friday morning. Trooper Craig Gaines fired a single round at the car when it appeared the driver was trying to run him over, White said. The bullet struck the driver's side door, but did not penetrate the car. The car then spun out of control and crashed into a house, White said.

Killer seeks relief from life sentence

POCATELLO — Eight years after he brutally murdered a Bannock County woman, Jarrett Luke Enno, 25, is asking for some hope that he can one day be released from prison.

Enno, who was 18 when he killed Joanne Freeman, has asked 6th District Judge William Woodland to reconsider his sentence of life in prison without possibility of parole.

Public Defender Randy Schulties has asked Woodland to have Enno returned to Pocatello so he can appear at the post-conviction relief hearing. Schulties also wants the Correction Department to provide the judge with a report on Enno's progress.

Boise officer cleared in shootout death

BOISE — Mario Jaramillo aimed his 9 mm semiautomatic handgun at Boise Police officer Clay Christensen on June 24 and pulled the trigger.

The gun jammed, sparing Christensen's life, and Jaramillo fled. The gun jammed 11 minutes later, Christensen shot Jaramillo to death with a Colt AR-15 — a civilian version of an M-16 combat rifle. Boise Police released details of the shooting Wednesday. They also announced that Christensen and officer Scott Mulcahy were cleared of wrongdoing in two investigations.

Bird troubles hard to swallow for homeowner

KENDRICK (AP) — Hundreds of cliff swallows have descended on Randy O'Callaghan's home, building nests and splattering its freshly painted walls as quickly as he can spray them off.

The swallows flew in Sunday in a scene reminiscent of the movie "The Birds." Idaho Department of Fish and Game employees and Washington State University veterinarians are searching for explanations.

"This is a real mystery," said Erik Stauber, professor of veterinary medicine and head of the exotic animal ward at Washington State.

Stauber said he assumes the birds' original nesting site has been destroyed, forcing them to build new shelters. Since it is the swallows' breeding season, he said, there is an urgency in setting up new homes for laying their eggs.

The birds' nests have been at least partially destroyed by a cliff swallow and colony nesters and make their homes in cliffs, as their name suggests.

GOP parks measures draw criticism

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — Coca-Cola National Park? Nike National Monument?

Supporters of two bills in Congress that would authorize a National Park Service corporate sponsorship program say it would never happen.

"But opponents are concerned it could lead to commercialization of landmarks regarded as temples of nature, not commerce."

"We do not want the park brought to you by the Acme Denner Corporation," said Chip Dennerlein, the Alaska regional director for the National Parks and Conservation Association, a parks advocacy group.

The proposals are part of an effort to address the budget shortfall at parks as a result of some campground closures at the system's seeing a record number of visitors.

An estimated 270 million people will visit the parks this summer. But fewer rangers are on patrol, maintenance is being deferred and trash is not being picked up as frequently.

The maintenance backlog is estimated at up to \$4 billion, said Chuck Kleeschulte, spokesman for Sen. Frank Murkowski, Alaska, who sponsored the bill in the Senate. The measure was approved by the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee last month. An identical bill was introduced in the House on Tuesday, Rep. James Hansen, R-Utah, is the lead sponsor.

The proposal's backers are betting major corporations will be willing to pay millions of dollars for exclusive rights to put a new logo on their products identifying them as official sponsors of the national park system.

"It could raise the kind of money for the system that simply

could not be raised by other means," said Dennerlein, also a member of the National Park Service's citizens advisory board. "There is a need to look at fiscal reality."

The proposal has bipartisan support in Congress, the Clinton administration's backing and support within the National Park Service.

The National Park Foundation, the non-profit group that helped draft the proposal, envisions as

many as a dozen corporations contributing up to \$10 million or more annually to the system. The plan has been compared to corporate sponsorship of the Olympic Games.

For the park administrators who have struggled to do more with less in recent years, the sponsorship proposal is welcome.

"We're enthused about the possibilities," said Bob Barbee, regional director with the National Park Service in Alaska.

Proposal could spur more campaign ads

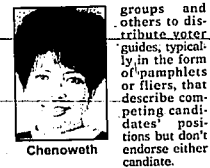
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Sierra Club wants to take a political staple — the printed voter guide that lists candidates' positions on key issues — and incorporate it into the video age with TV ads, targeted to the November elections.

The Sierra Club would take aim at members of Congress and other Republicans, who have voted to strip away environmental protections. "This is a new thing we're interested in trying out," said Carl Pope, executive director of the Sierra Club, a non-profit, tax-exempt group that is allowed to lobby and conduct some political activity.

But the innovation could unleash a new breed of campaign advertising, giving non-profit groups, unions and corporations even more freedom to spend their money on television ads to help their favorite candidates or hurt those they oppose.

Pope described the planned ads as part of "a very, very ambitious overall program designed to make sure the American people understand in some detail that we have just had the worst Congress in environmental history."

The TV ads would be based on FEC rules allowing non-profit

A potential target is Idaho Republican Sen. Chenoweth, who has been consistently at odds with environmental interests and is getting a tougher than expected challenge from Democrat Dan Williams. "It's a clearly identified person we're trying to help, whether an incumbent, a challenger or an open seat; a clear difference between the candidates' environmental records; and where the environment is a salient issue," Weiss said.

### Sales tax best way to pay for property tax relief

Idaho lawmakers, fiercely prodded by tax warrior Ron Rankin, are once again talking about altering Idaho's tax structure. Whether this is good news remains to be seen.

Tax issues are devilishly complex, but they also are as basic as a brick. An endless number of competing interests and labyrinthine formulas beset our lawmakers. But for thousands of angry taxpayers, the problem is plain: Property taxes are too darned high.

The One Percent Initiative on Idaho's November ballot is a collective scream for help from Rankin's fed-up followers. Never mind that the attorney general has declared it "unimplementable," or that state and local officials are unable to predict its effects of programs. The people who signed Rankin's petitions are demanding attention to their complaint, and they are getting it.

Rep. Jim Kampton, R-Albion, one of the Legislature's tax tinkers, says the Legislature will work on some kind of property tax relief next winter, regardless of whether Rankin's initiative passes.

Vexed property owners should feel some satisfaction about the attention. But they also must keep three key points in mind:

First, government isn't going to get significantly smaller. Rankin likes to say property tax relief can be had without unpleasant consequences, simply by chopping low-priority expenses. Not so. Our Republican-dominated Legislature has always been tight with a dollar; curtable fat is not abundant.

Second, property taxes are the

only form of taxation controlled by local voters. Moving the taxing function from the localities to Boise moves the power, too.

Third, there are no easy sources for new revenue. Sales, income and property taxes form the "three-legged stool" on which government rests. Weaken one, and the other two must carry more weight — and affected parties will howl.

These are some of the complexities that afflict the Legislature. They are why tax relief is never as simple as Rankin paints it.

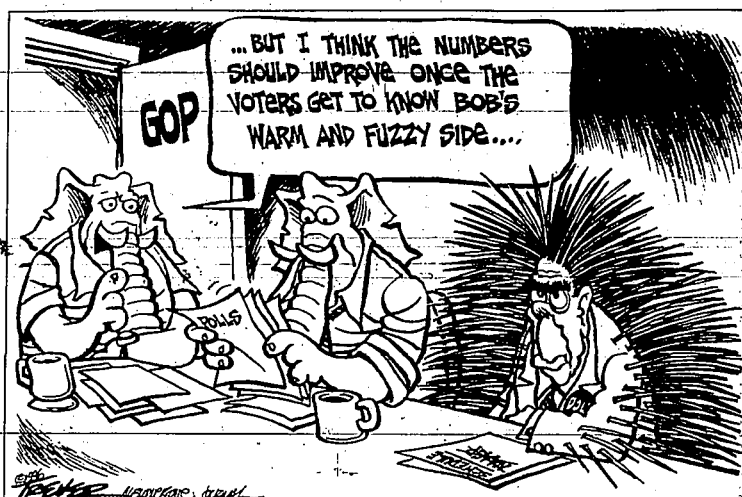
So what's to be done? In our view, higher income taxes would be a mistake. Idaho's income tax already is over 8 percent.

Raising the sales tax makes more practical sense, and more philosophical sense, too. At a basic level, income taxes penalize productivity; sales taxes attach to lifestyle.

Look to the Legislature to boost sales tax a penny or so, or perhaps remove the exemption for services. And look for another dalliance with a local-option sales tax — a too-long-neglected idea that combines property-tax relief with continued local control.

But also look for stiff opposition, from one group or another, to any of these ideas. And keep in mind: Idaho property taxes may seem high, but not when compared with other states. Just ask your out-of-state friends what they pay.

The fact is, any way you balance the tax stool annoys somebody. That's why this debate never goes away, and why the November decision on the One Percent, whatever the outcome, won't settle it for good.



## Time to face coming spending crunch

If nothing else, the presidential candidacy of ex-Coronado Gov. Richard Lamm reminds us of the air of urgency already surrounding the campaign of '96. Yes, he faces long odds of even capturing the Reform Party's nomination from Ross Perot. But Lamm has at least highlighted a central issue that both President Clinton and Bob Dole ignore: the graying of America.

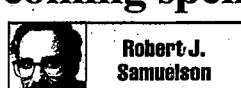
We shouldn't "create justice in this generation by creating injustice in the next," Lamm warns. He's right.

It's not simply that the elderly now represent the largest category of federal spending. In 1995, Social Security and Medicare alone accounted for 40 percent of noninterest outlays. The real problem is that, under present programs, these amounts will rise sharply in the next century. How much should the elderly be responsible for their retirements and how much should they rely on government? The question is irrefutably inescapable, and the answer will decisively shape government's future. But in the campaign, it's a nonissue.

Clinton says the election pits two philosophies of government. Not so. On many social issues (welfare, for instance), Clinton has virtually adopted the Republican position. Dole promises much smaller government. Not possible. It would require vast cuts in spending for the elderly that no one (including Dole) has proposed.

The real issue ought to be which candidate would begin to make the gradual changes in Social Security and Medicare demanded by an aging America — rather than having us wait until budget pressures compel far, more wrenching changes.

The present policy is avoidance. Here is an apt example: Medicare's home care program. It pays for visits of nurses and aides, who do everything from administering drugs to giving baths. In general, this is a good thing. Home visits often provide

care at a less cost and more comfort than someone could receive in a hospital or nursing home. But the program is open to abuse, and the costs are skyrocketing. In 1995, spending totaled \$16 billion, up from \$2.6 billion in 1989. That's a compounded annual growth rate of 35 percent.

I first learned of the program from a reader, whose mother, 83, uses it. The mother has osteoporosis; a loss of bone. Though cheerful, she is confined to her home. Four times a week, a visiting nurse administers calcium shots to retard bone loss. Each visit costs \$125. Once a week, an aide helps with a bath; that's \$75. The cost: \$726 a week or almost \$30,000 a year.

My reader — her daughter — feels torn. Living in another city, she can't provide care herself. Still, she considers the costs outrageous. Her mother hires a once-a-week housekeeper at about \$10 an hour. Couldn't someone else be found to help with baths at that price? The daughter thinks so. She also doubts whether the calcium shots are needed, because her mother takes calcium pills and other medication to retard bone loss. The daughter's husband, a doctor, agrees; but the mother likes the daily visits.

No one has any reason to stop them, because Medicare pays all the costs. There's no copayment required from recipients, as with most Medicare doctors' bills. Spending controls are "lax," reports the General Accounting Office. Between 1989 and 1995, the share of Medicare beneficiaries receiving home health care doubled, from 5 percent to 10 percent; the average number of annual visits per user almost

tripled, from 27 to 70.

In theory, doctors approve all use of home care. In practice, controls are weak, because the pressure to approve is intense. "The patients and their families demand it," says Dr. Douglas Horton, a surgeon in Texas. "It's their right. If I make a patient or family angry, it could be the first step toward a lawsuit." GAO suspects "overutilization," spurred partly by an explosion of for-profit home health-care agencies. Between 1989 and 1995, their number doubled to 3,730.

Home care mirrors larger dilemmas. How to help the old without overburdening the young? How to prevent needed services from becoming costly conveniences? If choices were easy, they'd already have been made. No election can conceivably settle all the messy details. But it might create a climate in which politicians could grapple with the details. That isn't happening.

The whole subject is conspicuous by its absence. Dole apparently fears raising it, and Clinton thinks the budget battle solidified his popularity with seniors. Lamm (and Perot, too) may be useful if they challenge this cynical silence. The more Clinton and Dole adhere to it, the less the campaign will connect with the actual problems of governing. Population pressures ordain a collision between rising beneficiaries and dwindling taxpayers. In 1990, there were five workers for each American over 65; by 2020, it's estimated that there will be about three.

So all the rhetoric about "big government" may sound meaningful, but it won't be. For most Americans, the significant questions about government involve how much is spent on the elderly. A debate that pretends otherwise is phony.

The "Normal School" method was chosen in 1837 by Horace Mann to be the way to properly train elementary teachers.

# Netanyahu pays visit to Egypt.

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — On his first visit to an Arab country as Israel's prime minister, Benjamin Netanyahu brought words of peace Thursday to a region shaken by his election victory two months ago.

While the Israeli leader took no major steps to push forward the stalled Middle East peace process, he went out of his way to praise his Egyptian hosts, particularly President Hosni Mubarak, and took pains to at least speak the language of peace.

"We agreed that we must intensify our efforts to expand the circle of peace, which of course is important for both Israel and Egypt and the entire region," Netanyahu said after a two-hour meeting with Mubarak. "We believe that the peace should be based on the idea of fulfilling existing commitments."

He hailed Egypt as "the pivot of peace" and said he felt "renewed confidence" that peace could be achieved.

Netanyahu arrived Thursday a wildly unpopular figure, facing deep anger over what many Arabs consider a betrayal of years of difficult negotiations. All week, Egyptian newspapers published bitter attacks, unprecedented before a visit of a foreign leader. "No to the Rotten Smell in the Land of Egypt," read the headline of the opposition newspaper El-Ahram on Thursday.

It was an oft-repeated play on Netanyahu's name — in Arabic, "neten" means "rotten smell."

# U.N. accepts Iraqi plan for disbursing aid

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — Iraq moved one step closer to pumping oil for export Thursday when the United Nations accepted its plan for distributing food and medicine to Iraqis.

The United Nations agreed in May to permit Iraq to sell \$2 billion worth of oil every 180 days to buy humanitarian supplies. Iraq needed to show up a distribution plan acceptable to the U.N. before the sales could begin.

"I am happy that the distribution plan has been accepted," U.N. Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali told Iraqi chief negotiator Abdel Amir al-Anbari.

A U.N. committee still needs to approve separate procedures for the exports, which could be finalized next week. Western diplomats have said Iraqi oil could begin flowing by the end of August.

The oil-for-food deal is an exemption to sweeping economic sanctions the United Nations imposed on Iraq after Baghdad's 1990 invasion of Kuwait. The deal is designed to alleviate civilian suffering caused by the trade embargo.

# Poll: Public wants Diana as 'highness'

LONDON (AP) — Half the British public thinks Princess Diana should remain a "royal highness" after divorcing Prince Charles, according to a poll published Thursday.

Under her agreement with Prince Charles, Diana will be known as Diana, Princess of Wales, but will not be called "her royal highness." That is a symbolic demotion from the elite of the royal family, and ranks Diana higher on the royal hierarchy than her two sons.

The divorce is expected to become final on Aug. 28.

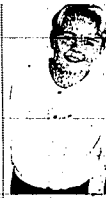

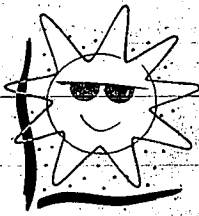

## GSI philosophy instructor will teach kids fine art of Chinese calligraphy

TWIN FALLS — Chinese calligraphy is more than just fancy writing; it's a high form of art.

"The Chinese see calligraphy as (a step above) painting, because it is prior to painting, and the elements are basic to painting," explained Brenda Larsen, a philosophy and world religions instructor at the College of Southern Idaho.

Larsen will be teaching several Magic Valley children some of the basic ideas and brush strokes used in this type of calligraphy this weekend during Kids Art in the Park.

Teaching this to kids isn't new to Larsen, since she taught calligraphy at the Sawtooth Elementary School Gifted and Talented program. She said the kids — and the adults — get really interested once they learn the history behind the Chinese characters.

Early drawings have evolved into the current system of characters in all Asian writings.

Larsen describes this as "pictographic elements," with each character having an element of early pictures in them.

For the few hours that Larsen will be teaching the children, she will keep the lesson simple by teaching some of the basic brush strokes and then letting the kids experiment.

"Some characters have maybe 20 different strokes," which are too many for young ones to grasp in three hours, she explained.

The art is expressed in the individuality of the brush strokes, and this is where the kids can have a lot of fun.

"There are standards ... in the writing, but they (Asian people) accept much more personal expression in calligraphy," Larsen explained.

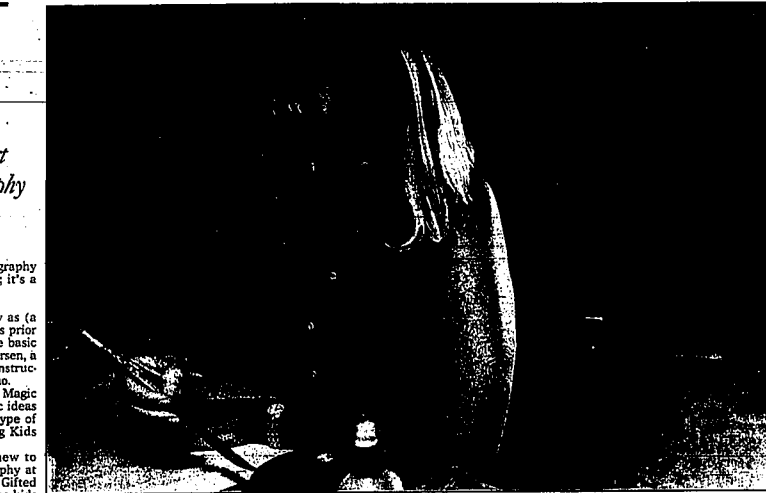
Many Chinese appreciate what Westerners might call "plain" calligraphy, on which the characters are drawn on rice paper to decorate their walls and homes.

"In Taiwan, everyone has calligraphy over their front door and hanging down the sides of the door," Larsen said. These pieces will be a poem or a saying of which the family is particularly fond.

Chinese calligraphic arts probably spend years studying and reinterpreting classical styles in brush strokes, find one piece and practice it over and over until he gets good enough to put it in an art gallery.

"It's bringing the beauty of language and the beauty of art together," Larsen said.

Larsen said there is also a lot of work involved for the consummate artist, since many of them will grind their own ink.

A huge fire is built, and the ashes are blown to collect the finest particles. These fine particles are glued into sticks.

"They'll take an ink stone and grind those sticks into the consistency (of ink) they want," Larsen said. This is called "sumi ink."

Larsen studied for a while in China, where she picked up much of her information not only on Chinese characters and calligraphy, but also part of the culture.

"But, I wrote my masters thesis on classical Chinese philosophy, and that's what has led me to (Chinese calligraphy)," she said.

The basic brush strokes are taught to all Asian children during their early years, and someone who writes beautifully is considered well-

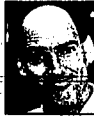

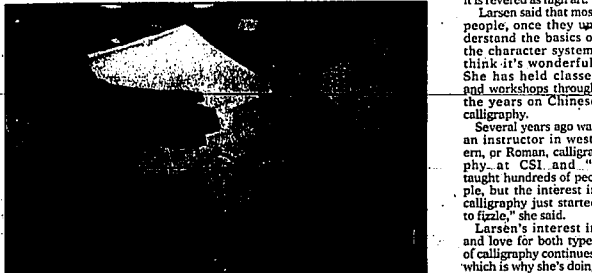

# Disabled musician brings act to Twin Falls Sun Valley arts center begins exhibit

**TWIN FALLS** — Tony Melendez named his musical production company TOEJAM, because "JAM" are his initials — and because he plays his guitar with his toes.

Born Jose Antonio Melendez 34 years ago in Nicaragua, the musician was a thalidomide baby. He was born without arms after his mother was prescribed drugs during pregnancy.

His parents moved to Los Angeles so their son could be fitted with artificial arms, which he wore until he was 10.

"I didn't feel comfortable," he has said of his decision stop using the arms. "I could use my feet so much more."

Today, the fact that Melendez has no arms is no hindrance to his songwriting, singing or instrumental abilities. He's known in his music as one of the United States (he's never been to Wyoming) and 13 other countries.

He's appeared on TV shows like "The Today Show," "Good Morning America," "The Late Show with Arsenio Hall" and "700 Club." He's received awards from President Reagan, Variety Clubs America and several Arts and Crafts fairs.

He was nominated for Best New Artist of the Year (Cashbox Magazine) and the Gospel Music Association for his 1995 album titled "Never Be the Same." And his debut Spanish album, "El Muro Se Cayo and the Walls Came Tumbling Down" was re-

leased to critical acclaim by Latin radio stations throughout the country.

His best-selling autobiography, "A Gift of Hope," was published by Harper & Row.

In 1987, Melendez ran across a group of people organizing activities for the Los Angeles visit of Pope John Paul II. A devout Catholic and several ended up playing "Never Be the Same" for the church world leader.

"I was told not to move over the security might take me out, so I was very surprised when the Pope walked over and leaped off the 3-foot stage to greet me," Melendez said at the time.

Soon after that experience, while Melendez was performing a concert in Dallas, he met a woman working at a Catholic diocese there. The two married six years ago and were blessed with a daughter, Marissa, in August 1994.

His wife, Lynn, sometimes accompanies him on tour. He's on the road 15 to 20 days a month.

"I don't make any special arrangements," said Melendez in a phone interview from his home earlier this month. "I just have someone go along with me to rent a car so people don't just look at me and flip out."

He's always been like that. He insists his teen years were no tougher than anyone else's ("I didn't have arms since birth" — it was nothing new), and he says his parents treated him the same as his brother and sisters.

Melendez learned his music in the slower, he said. He has formal training, but was raised by a mom who sang and a dad who played musical instruments.

"He's always kept his music focused on a message and he's put his focus on it," said his mother, who lives in the way.

While he's in Twin Falls, he will spend time with the young people at the Juvenile Detention Center and the Boys & Girls Club of Magic Valley, showing them they can succeed in spite of difficulties.

"Whether it's giving disabled people or whole-bodied people, I just call them to always keep going forward and do their best," Melendez said. "And if you can't do something, try it a different way."

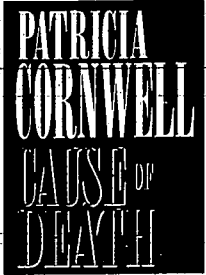

# Cornwell's 'Cause': More from mistress of whodunits

When readers got their last glimpse of Dr. Kay Scarpetta, the chief medical examiner for the State of Virginia was inside a helicopter hovering above Riker's Island. That scene closed out last year's best-selling "From Potter's Field," which took Scarpetta to New York City in pursuit of serial killer Temple Gault, whom she'd tangled with before.

In "Cause of Death," Dr. Scarpetta is back — back in Virginia and back in charge. The novel is the seventh in Patricia Cornwell's enormously popular series about the brilliant forensic sleuth and consultant to the FBI, who invariably winds up in the middle of whatever horrific case she's investigating.

"You've really gotten into something, Aunt Kay," observes Lucy, Scarpetta's beloved niece who is an FBI computer whiz. "Why does this always happen to you?"

In "Cause of Death," Putnam, \$22.95, Scarpetta mixes it up with a high-wire paramilitary group with connections to international terrorists. And because Lucy once again plays a substantial supporting role, the plot on this outing encompasses computers, robotics, and even a smattering of virtual reality.

The elaborate tale begins when the body of Ted Eddings, an award-winning investor in the region, is found by the Associated Press based in Richmond, is found on New Year's Eve in the Elizabeth River in Norfolk. He had been diving in the ship yard, a restricted area that is home to the Navy's mothballed

secret "Book of Hand," which sets forth "in exquisite detail how to kill and maim, frighten, brainwash and torture."

As usual, Cornwell has laced "Cause of Death" with arcane tidbits about wine, Italian cooking, secrets, and little-known scientific gems, such as disclosing that the ability to detect the bitter almond scent of cyanide is a sex-linked, recessive trait inherited by less than 30 percent of the population.

But more important, Cornwell demonstrates anew why her legions of fans include those who normally shun "murder" mysteries and thrillers. She is a talented writer with an unerring eye for detail. And her major characters are vivid and complex, especially Scarpetta and her improbable sidekick, Capt. Pete Marino, a former New Yorker terminally lacking in political correctness.

Despite the background work Cornwell has done for her new book, she is not as home in the world of paramilitary recruits and nuclear power plants as she is in Scarpetta's usual morgue environs. As a result, the threat of Hand and his troops seems a bit more theoretical than real.

But even if the latest installment lacks some of the visceral punch of the earlier novels, Cornwell is such a master of narrative pacing that once "Cause of Death" has been started, it is still all but impossible to put it down until the final page. Then, the only remaining question is: Where will Scarpetta turn up next?

Though they do not appear together, stars Meg Ryan and Denzel Washington invigorate the film, with Washington especially raising his work to a new level. (R, for war violence and language.) "Dragonheart" — A frustrating combination of the magical and the mundane, this thousand-year-old buddy movie has less difficulty creating a credible dragon than a recognizable human being. Dennis Quaid stars, Sean Connery speaks for the dragon. (PG-13, action and violence.) (Motor-Vu Drive-in, Burley Theater)

"Fled" — Arnold Schwarzenegger is at it again, talking lies and saving the world. Here he is a stalwart of the federal witness-protection plan, having to keep Vanessa Williams away from the scoundrel of doom. It's tough work, and the big guy is starting to look tired. (R, for violent action throughout and some language.) (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema, Magic Lantern Cinema of Ketchikan)

"The Frighteners" — Directed by the eccentric Peter Jackson ("Heavenly Creatures"), this trash dark comedy of the dead-turned-evil psyches and the unnerving as it goes along. Saucy and scary, it creates the illusion of spinning out of control directly in front of us. (R, terror/violence.) (Twin Cinema, Century Cinema of Burley, Ace Theater of Wendell, Ski Time 4 Cinemas of Ketchikan)

"Harriet the Spy" — Welcome to the spyhouse: The beloved novel by Louise Fitzhugh arrives on the screen as a study in prepubescent torment, although one with energy, good performances and some sturdy object lessons. With Michelle Trachtenberg, Gregory Smith, Vanessa Lee Chester, Ronnie Donnal. (PG, mild language and some thematic elements.) (Twin Cinema, Jerome Cinema)

"Homeward Bound 2" — Giving voice to a dog's insular life is probably a noble pursuit, so it's inspiring to hear Michael J. Fox straining against his tether to do so in this movie. Children may giggle but none of them will be old enough to attend without a tormented adult. This is not a violence movie. (Rated G.) (Gooding Cinema)

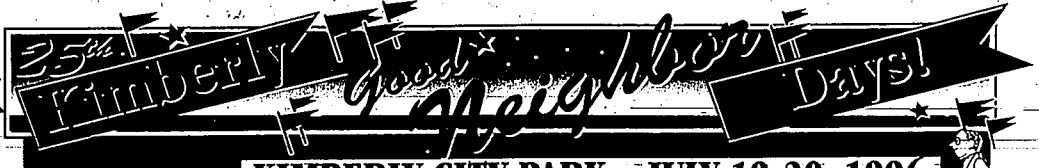

## The Who's back together — sort of

LONDON — If the Who has to reunite, let it be for "Quadrophenia."  
Earlier this month, Pete Townshend, John Entwistle and Roger Daltrey (wearing a patch to cover a black eye acquired in a rehearsal accident), played before a crowd of 150,000 on a gray, chilly English summer day at the Prince's Trust concert in London's Hyde Park.

The excuse for the trio's first reunion since 1989's 25th anniversary tour was a start-to-finish presentation of Townshend's second-best-known, little-heard rock opera. The work had never before been performed in its entirety. Helping on drums was Zack Starkey, Ringo's son. Originally released as a double album in 1973 and adapted into a movie in 1979, "Quadrophenia" is an ambitious Townshend opus that contains some of his most sophisticated, intelligent and passionate music.

And it's going to get the hearing it deserves. Tuesday, a remastered, double CD of the original "Quadrophenia" album will be released. On July 14, HBO will air a condensed version of the Prince's Trust show. And then

the Who will bring "Quadrophenia" to New York's Madison Square Garden for six concerts, July 16 to 18 and 20 to 22. The first five were sold out, the last one all but, as of Sunday. Future U.S. dates? None is scheduled, a Who spokesman says. "I'm not really, at this time, in Hyde Park," Townshend said. "Quadrophenia" was the most hotly anticipated attraction on a super geizers of rock bill. Eric Clapton, 51, headlined, with a polished set that mixed electrified blues with big hits. Bob Dylan, 55, wheezy-voiced as ever, stretched out with his masterful jamming band augmented by Rolling Stone Ron Wood on guitar. Alanis Morissette, 21, whose avenger's anthem "You Oughta Know" has made her as hot in England as she is in the States, warmed the crowd up.

Officially titled the "Masters of Music Concert for the Prince's Trust," it drew a civilized, strawberry-and-cream and cellular-phonics mega-crowd, guilty of nothing more rebellious than turning the park into one vast urinal.

The ridiculously cheap tickets (8 pounds, or \$12) had sold out in 48 hours. The show was expected to raise more than \$750,000 for charity.

There were celeb sightings — Mick Jagger, Boris Becker,

For Scott Ian, the biggest problem Anthrax faced as it headed into the '90s was summed up in a story the band's manager told. "He was at his local gas station in Pennsylvania, and he was talking to the kid who worked there," Ian says. "He said, 'What do you think of Anthrax?' And the guy goes: 'Oh, yeah, they're great. I love those guys.'"

"So our manager said, 'What's your favorite song by them?' And the kid couldn't really name a song."

"That said a lot to me," Ian con-

tinues. "Because as big as we were in the '80s, there was a lack of identity. People weren't able to latch onto one thing and say, 'That's Anthrax.'"

What does Ian want them to latch onto? "We just want to be a really, really heavy band that can write songs," he says. "That's all we want to be." "Stomp 442," the band's current album, goes a long way toward achieving that end. Stripped-down and tuneful, the album's songs deliver the same surging power and immediate gratification a hot rodder feels when stomping on a muscle car's accelerator. (It's no

surprise, then, to learn that the "442" of the title refers to the displacement of a classic Oldsmobile engine.)

# No Pepsi at '96 Games

ATLANTA — And so, finally, the waiting is over, and the time has come to begin the Games of the XXVI Olympiad — better known as, simply, "The Official Sports Marketing Event of the Coca-Cola Corp."

When all is said and done, this massive extravaganza will involve over 23,000 athletes from 2,783 nations competing in 7,423 individual sports, ranging from Synchronized Air Rifle to Wheelchair Tennis to mention 163,000 journalists, 835,000 security personnel, 23 million Nike marketing executives, 417 million members of the actual Olympic public and four people driving shuttle buses. These figures are only estimates, of course; a lot of people suspect that there are only two people driving shuttle buses.

But despite a few "trans" problems, it is a "glitches," the air here is thick with excitement and bodily aroma as the Olympic organizers welcome the world to Atlanta, which proudly calls itself "The City That Is Too Busy To Hate Because It Has Been Occupied Full-Time With Jacking Up Hotel And Restaurant Rates."

No, wait, I'm sorry. I really don't want to join in the general media-bashing of Atlanta. Atlanta contains a lot of nice people who are trying very hard to be good hosts. The problem is that Atlanta, through no fault of its own, is — Atlanta. We in the media have already been to Atlanta many times, and although we have found it to be an excellent place to change planes, we do not care for it as a destination city. We prefer to attend the Olympics in exotic foreign locales such as Norway or Los Angeles.

So we arrived here in a cranky and critical mood. And it has not helped matters that the Olympic operation in the downtown Atlanta area has basically the same level of dignity, sophistication and grandeur as a Veg-O-Matic commercial. It looks as though a giant vacuum cleaner went around sucking up all the T-shirt, hat, souvenir and corn-dog booths in all the county fairs in America and then spewed them out randomly on the downtown streets. There is also a six-story Coke bottle, as well as large statues of such Olympic legends as Marilyn Monroe and Elvis ("The Official Funke Funke Bizarre Love Of The Summer Games"). The makers of Switch Witches ("The Official Timepiece of the \$25-\$40 Price Range And You Definitely Get What You Pay For At The Summer Games") have hung a gigantic wristwatch from the side of a building. We can be grateful that there is no Official Hemorrhoid Remedy, because otherwise I guarantee you that there would be a suppository the size of the Washington Monument. Or maybe I just haven't seen it yet.

If you maybe the foreign journalists, many of whom have never been to Atlanta, will view it with a less-jaded eye. I rode in from the airport with a group of Swedish journalists, and I had plenty of time to monitor their reactions because our hotel-shuttle-bus driver, for security reasons, had not been told where any of the hotels are actually located. As we inched through the heavy downtown traffic, he would periodically open his window and yell "TO THE RADISSON?" And whichever way the bus was pointed, the officer would point the other way.

So anyway, I spent a lot of time listening to the Swedes discuss their reactions to Atlanta. Unfortunately, since they were speaking in Swedish, I am not sure what they were saying, but their tone and facial expressions, I think the gist of it was: "I don't know about you, Sven, but what with the long flight from Sweden, and humidity here in Atlanta, by the time we get to the hotel I will have to set fire to my underwear."

I ended up getting off the bus and walking to my hotel. I think I had more than enough luggage to walk, may spend the entire Olympics circling around in the downtown area on the shuttle bus, surviving my entire fire-igniting Olympic Welcome Guides, then just shuffling back to the airport at the end. They could be the lucky ones.

# For athletes, waiting finally over

ATLANTA — One more day. That's how much longer a lucky group of athletes have to wait to compete in the 1996 Summer Olympic Games.

The 10,000-plus athletes have trained for years. They've sacrificed, hoped, struggled, rebounded, overachieved and maxed-out on their way to Atlanta. They've put families on hold, injuries behind and dreams on the line.

Now it's almost time for them to take the stage.

The International Olympic Committee, the U.S. Olympic Committee and the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games have one final go in the spotlight Friday night with the Opening Ceremonies. Then it's off to the venues.

Swimming, baseball, basketball, boxing, fencing, soccer, gymnastics, field hockey, judo, shooting, volleyball, weightlifting and wrestling all get under way Saturday. The first medal will be awarded around midmorning at

the Wolf Creek Shooting Complex. As long as it took to reach the Olympics, the dream can vanish just as quickly. Just ask Kim Zmeskal. Four years ago, she was one of the favorites heading into the gymnastics competition. Fifteen seconds into her balance

beam routine, she slipped. There went the gold. There went the glory.

For these Games, she's a handy woman with the U.S. team.

The Olympics are a learning experience if nothing else. What advice would some of the athletes offer on the eve of what could be their crowning fortnight in sports?

"Follow your dreams, work hard, nothing's out of your reach," said Jenny Thompson, who anchored the world-record 400-meter freestyle relay team in Barcelona and will swim the same event in Atlanta. "Have fun, that's the most important thing."

Diver Mary Ellen Clark adds this: "Find something you love to do and follow your heart. You really can fulfill your dream and overcome obstacles."

Clark should know, having overcome vertigo to make her second Olympic team.

Amy Van Dyken, who battles asthma, knows who her biggest foe is; herself. "My competition is within myself," she said Thursday.

"I have prepared for it from the Olympic village. I've had three days from now. Win or lose, I want people to know that 115 percent went into my effort."

While Van Dyken is expected to pose a strong threat at the Georgia Tech venue, she isn't the U.S.-lost legitimate medal contender when Pete Sampras withdrew Tuesday with a strained right Achilles tendon.

This is a very unfortunate time to suffer an injury, Sampras said. "I was really looking forward to competing at the Olympics. After I lost at Wimbledon, I was determined to make up for it by winning a gold medal. I'm very disappointed."

Already, the range of Olympic emotions are running the gamut. At the other end is U.S. wrestler Matt Ghafari.

"I have been waiting for this opportunity all my life to wrestle in the Olympics for my home country," he said. "I would like my gravestone to say, 'Matt Ghafari, Olympic medalist.'"

# From Athens to Atlanta: A history of the Summer Games

Highlights of past Olympiads:

- 1896 Athens**  
70,000 witness modest beginning. First gold won by U.S. triple jumper James Connolly.
- 1900 Paris**  
Fledgling Games. Many attached to previously scheduled international exhibition. U.S. golfer Peggy Abbott is first woman to win gold.
- 1904 St. Louis**  
Few foreign athletes attend 75-day Games, attached to World's Fair celebration of Louisiana Purchase centennial. Blacks officially compete for first time.
- 1906 Athens**  
Successful unofficial Games spark renewed interest.
- 1908 London**  
Solid organization becomes standard for subsequent Games; British officiating heavily criticized.
- 1912 Stockholm**  
"Innovative" Games continue despite rumors of war in Europe; U.S. freestyles at the 1992 Olympics, is the favorite in both this year, and holds the world record in the 100.
- 1916 Berlin**  
Canceled due to World War I.
- 1920 Antwerp**  
Austere facilities produce poor athletic performances; led by legendary Paavo Nurmi. Finnish dominance of distance races begins.
- 1924 Paris**  
In triumphant Games, British "Chariots of Fire" runners — Harold Abrahams, Eric Liddell — win gold; Johnny Weismuller, U.S., becomes swimming hero.
- 1928 Amsterdam**  
First track and field competition for women; track standardized at 400 meters; Johnny Weissmuller repeats Paris success.
- 1932 Los Angeles**  
In midst of Great Depression, frontier town stages a success; photo-electric timer introduced; U.S. Babe Didrikson shines.
- 1936 Berlin**  
Wine by Jesse Owens, other U.S. "Black auxiliaries" thwart Nazi propaganda; U.S. wins first basketball tournament.

First Games in southern hemisphere; Al Oerter, U.S., wins first of four straight discus golds; first political boycotts; East, West Germany compete under one flag.
- 1960 Rome**  
Games staged in classical venues; first use of video tape; U.S.'s Wilma Rudolph, Cassius Clay dominate; women run distances greater than 400 meters for first time since 1928.
- 1964 Tokyo**  
In "Happy Games," Japan, first Asian nation to host, cleans up international reputation marred by World War II; South Africa banned for apartheid policy.
- 1968 Mexico City**  
Athletes adapt to 7,300-foot altitude; U.S. black athletes threaten boycott over international discrimination; first Games televised via satellite.
- 1972 Munich**  
Palestinian terrorists kill 11 Israeli athletes; Mark Spitz, U.S., wins seven swimming golds; Olga Korbut, Soviet Union, sparks gymnastics revolution.
- 1976 Montreal**  
Fear of terrorism plagues at first; African, Caribbean nations boycott; East Germany boycotts U.S. athletes; management, labor difficulties leave city with \$1.2 billion debt.
- 1980 Moscow**  
U.S. leads 62-nation women's boycott; poor invasion of Afghanistan; Soviets spend record \$5 billion, completely.
- 1984 Los Angeles**  
Soviet Union, 15 bloc nations retaliate with boycott; U.S. athletes dominate; organizer Peter Ueberroth helps turn \$223 million profit for privately funded Games.
- 1988 Seoul**  
North, South Korean tension subsides; no boycotts — first time; Ben Johnson, Canada, stripped of 100m gold for steroid use.
- 1992 Barcelona**  
Record 172 nations attend "New World Order" Games; professional athletes openly welcomed and paid; South Africa returns after 32-year ban.

# An Olympic question: Is fast food fit for the fastest?

ATLANTA (AP) — We're in the main dining tent of the Olympic Village and — look! — here come some members of China's women's gymnastics team. Let's see what they eat.

They graze past the first entree counter, glancing dubiously at steam tables thick with chicken, fish, sausage. Nope! Not for these little weightlifters.

Nope! They keep on walking... up to the salad bar, laden with just lettuce and tomatoes but French pate, Korean kimchee, Middle Eastern tabouli and couscous, Latin American ceviche.

Nope! They keep on walking... up to the fresh fruit bar, piled as high as the tallest gymnast with mountains of melons, cherries, apples, grapes. They fill their bowls, gleefully. And now they walk to their table, one of dozens spread across this vast white, air-conditioned canteen hangar.

But wait! Some of them keep walking. There they go... past the popular pasta bar, where the carbo loaders lurk, all the way to the back of the tent. And there, neatly framed by a pair of golden arches, is the Official Foodservice Partner of the Olympics.

Moments later, fries and — are those burgers? — in-hand, the smiling girls head back to their table.

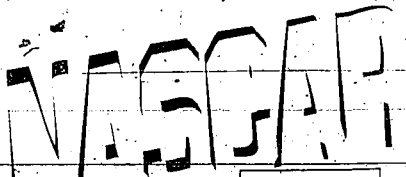
McDonald's, a worldwide sponsor of these centennial Olympic Games, is a major presence in Atlanta these days, with five restaurants in the athletes' Olympic Village alone. The company anticipates serving 81,000 Big Macs during 33 days of operation in the village, not to mention 163,000 medium orders of french fries.

This infuriates some critics of Ronald & Co., who argue that the presence of McDonald's in an athletic environment sends the wrong message about healthy eating. "There's the implication that if it's good fuel for the Olympians, it's certainly good for little Johnny and Susie," fumed Michael Jacobson, executive director of the Center for Science in the Public Interest. "What McDonald's serves is just what Americans shouldn't be eating."

McDonald's, for its part, has produced a slick press kit that includes quotations from dietitians about how McDonald's food can be part of a well-balanced athlete's diet.

The fact is... the visit to the dining hall here seemed to confirm that most athletes know how to eat healthily and usually do. The Chinese women were actually among just a few customers at the McDonald's counter during a busy dinner hour. Wednesday, while athletes were jostling for elbow room at the pasta table. "Athletes know a lot about food, so it's not a pro shooter from France. They're great care in what he eats, concentrating on low-fat, low-calorie foods like fish. McDonald's 'It's against my religion,' he joked.

"I am really having a good time," Menck said.

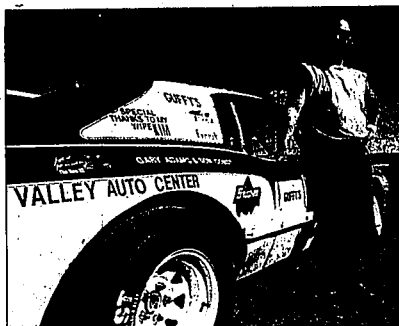
Ken raced motorcycles in Eastern Idaho from 1973 to 1981. He has lived off and on in the Twin Falls area, attending school in the Wood River Valley.

The advanced contentions that the rise in exports to all-time highs demonstrates the success of that strategy.

"It's still too early to basically argue that the relative advantage of the economy," he said, "is in the spring and early summer has simmered down as yet, so that there is a very legitimate concern ... about where the economy is headed," the Fed chairman said.

Consequently, the Fed has "moved to a level of heightened surveillance of what is going on" because developments in the next few weeks will be "crucial" to whether the economy is slowing fast enough to keep inflation pressures low.

Both the stock and bond markets rallied on the basis of Greenspan's remarks. Analysts had been expecting tougher language that would signal an increase in rates soon. Instead, they got an unusually clear statement of the Fed's thinking about both growth and inflation that gave no indication that central bank officials were eager to raise rates.

Stock prices regained some of the ground they lost earlier in the

month as the Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks rose 87.30 points, or 1.62 percent, to close at 5464.18. Meanwhile, yields on U.S. Treasury notes and bonds dropped by about a tenth of a percentage point, with those on 30-year bonds closing at 6.92 percent, down from 7.02 Wednesday.

In his prepared remarks, Greenspan did not mention the recent turmoil in the stock market. But in response to questions, he said the decline in equity values was due to investor concerns about long-term interest rates and about the prospect of future corporate earnings.

"And the Fed chairman added, 'I think that the reason why the most recent (stock market) volatility has caught our attention is we haven't had much of that in recent years, and it is that which is unusual, not the most recent period.'"

Mickey Levy, chief financial economist at Citicorp in New York, said Greenspan's testimony changed the minds of some investors and analysts who were convinced the Fed would raise rates no later than the next policy-making session on Aug. 20.

"He gave an enhanced testimony (that) left open the issue of what the Fed is going to do," Levy said. "He was very sensitive to a fragile market."

slow and stock prices will fall further, look to invest in utility stocks or growth stocks that can increase earnings even if the economy slumps.

"These are the times that try investors souls, but in the long run you're still better off with stocks," says David Soverby, senior portfolio manager for Ann Arbor, Mich.-based Bancorp Investment Co.

"Whether you're Bill Gates or Joe Average, those who buy stocks get wealthy, those who hold too much cash don't."

"If you still are nervous about stocks, here are some alternatives: Money Market Deposit Accounts. Ultra-safe money-market funds at banks are paying 2.7 percent a year. The rate is low because the deposit is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. If you're willing to do without the insurance, you can earn more on a money market account offered through your broker or mutual fund company."

"Taxable Money Market Mutual Funds. Many investors, especially owners of mutual fund investors, fled from stocks this week for the safety of money market funds. Unfortunately, they may not know what they've invested in. Some funds invest only in short-term U.S. Treasuries, which are guaranteed by the federal government. Others invest in those funds are averaging 4.56 percent, according to IBC's Money Fund Report.

Other money funds invest in a few of things, including commercial paper and repurchase agreements.

The average on these fund now is 4.78 percent. No retail customer has ever lost money in these funds, but "there's definitely no guarantee that they're perfectly safe," says Burk, editor IBC's Money Fund Report.

"Certificates of Deposit. Rates on these trusty savings devices are paying as little as 4.6 percent, but they're suddenly popping again because you can't lose money in them, says Robert Healey, publisher of 100 Highest Yield, a publication that tracks the best CD's.

"CD's are a sure-fire way to avoid the white-knuck experience of bungee jumping on Wall Street," Healey says.

"Bonds. In the past year, many investors shunned bonds for stocks. But as interest rates have risen this year, so have bond yields. Most attractive: the yield on 30-year Treasury bonds, now at 7 percent. If you don't want to lock your money up for long, stick with short-term Treasuries. That way you can move back into stocks when you want to."

"While these investments are safe, they are not entirely without risk. For one thing, if you subtract the effect of a 2.5 percent inflation rate, you're really earning little on your investment. But there's another risk that could prove far more costly. Once your money is in a fund, you may not have the smarts or the guts to buy back into stocks before they rebound to new highs. It's nearly impossible for even professionals to figure out when stocks have hit rock bottom, or when they've hit their peak."

U.S. Bancorp reports earnings up

PORTLAND, Ore. — U.S. Bancorp says its merger with West One Bancorp and acquisition of California Bancshares helped boost second-quarter net income by 25 percent.

The Portland-based bank holding company on Wednesday reported net income of \$127 million, or 82 cents a share. That compared to nearly \$99 million in earnings in the same quarter a year earlier, and 63 cents a share.

Total revenue, or total operating income, was reported at \$211 million, up from \$192 million in the same period last year.

Chairman and chief executive officer Gerry Cameron said the quarter's increased earnings were due to "the smooth integration" of the West One merger and completion of the California Bancshares acquisition.

Salt Lake OKs hotel complex

SALT LAKE CITY — A conditional use permit from the city has paved the way for Sinclair Oil to begin construction of its \$180 million five-star hotel next month.

The company plans to build its 900-room

convention center and hotel around property owned by two downtown businesses, the Flower Patch and the Avito Class.

The commission's conditional use permit allows Sinclair Oil to build its project farther back from the street than city ordinance requires. It also can build the hotel taller at the mid-block location and shorter on the corners than the ordinance calls for, said Salt Lake City Principal Planner Doug Dansie.

The Sinclair complex would employ 900 people and generate more than \$7 million in annual taxes.

30-year mortgage rates dip

WASHINGTON — Thirty-year, fixed rate mortgages averaged 8.23 percent this week, down from 8.42 percent last week, according to a national survey released Thursday by the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp.

It was the lowest since July 3, when rates averaged 8.14 percent. The 8.42 percent average last week was the highest since rates averaged 8.62 percent in early March 1995.

On one-year adjustable rate mortgages,

lenders were asking an average initial rate of 5.57 percent, down from 6.01 percent last week. Fifteen-year mortgages, a popular option for those refinancing mortgages, averaged 7.76 percent this week, down from 7.93 percent a week earlier.

Timber firm's profits plummet

FEDERAL WAY, Wash. — Weyerhaeuser Co.'s second-quarter profits were down 58 percent compared to a year ago, due mostly to lower prices for pulp, paper and packaging, the wood products company said Wednesday.

For the quarter ended June 30, net earnings were \$10.2 million or 52 cents a share, compared with \$246.7 million or \$12.1 a share for second-quarter 1995.

Net sales in the second quarter were \$2.9 billion, down 4 percent from the \$3 billion of a year ago. For the first six months of 1996, profits were \$245 million or \$12.4 a share on net sales of \$5.2 billion, compared with \$453 million or \$2.21 a share on net sales of \$4.7 billion in the first half of 1995.

Even John Travolta, who's been on the comeback trail in a big way, hasn't met with unanimous praise for his work in "Phantom."

Q: Can you tell us once and for all if Courteney Cox of "Friends" is having an affair with Christian Slater. If he has an entanglement and if she's a closet cholocho? — B.L.

A: No, not that I know of and yes. That's cutting to the chase.

My Hollywood spies maintain that Michael Keaton remains the love of Cox's life. He have been an item since 1988, although their romance has sustained a few interruptions. Courteney's relationship with Slater is said to be a longtime friendship.

# Cable TV: Not a sure BET after OJ coup

HOLLYWOOD — It was not too long ago that O.J. Simpson pulled Black Entertainment Television into the television big top.

BET, the nation's only black-owned cable network, had been largely unknown to mainstream television audiences outside its core African American viewership until last January, when it scored a live interview with the man who was then the nation's most hotly sought-after celebrity: Simpson, acquitted double-murder suspect.

The Jan. 25 session between Simpson and BET news anchor Ed Gordon brought BET, which aired mostly rap music videos and infomercials, unprecedented scrutiny. Media critics and major news outlets said they were unable to get their own interview with the football star — questioned whether Gordon and BET had the news credibility to take on Simpson. Some of the criticism also pointed out that the network was the only TV outlet then willing to let Simpson advertise his video about the murder case.

Gordon's probing of Simpson received unfavorable reviews, however. With the resulting publicity, BET seemed poised to launch a higher profile in the television arena with a heavier focus on news and social programming.

BET's star has dimmed since then. "I don't think anything has really changed with BET," said Kathy Haesele, senior vice president of Advertisers, a media-buying company. "Everything is status quo with them. I don't know what this interview could have done for them in the long term. But they are a little bit more fearful before." Fearful over the interview,

Gordon himself has prospered. He was recently hired at NBC News as an anchor for the new MSNBC cable channel and a correspondent for "Dateline NBC."

While ratings for the network have improved somewhat — up 15 percent this year after a 40 percent drop late last year — none of the network's programming has received the attention the Simpson interview attracted. A cover story in the Los Angeles Reader, a weekly newspaper, recently blasted the network, saying that "BET 15 years and it's just chronically disappointing, a grinding reminder that just because a black man's driving the bus doesn't mean it's going anywhere new."

Emphasis on news or topical programming has been pushed to the background, much as it was pre-Simpson, while the racy rap videos have returned the Rev. Jamall Horton Bryant, the youth director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, said earlier this month at the organization's annual convention that many African American young people were afflicted with a "BET video mentality" that glorifies casual sex, violence and materialism.

BET may be the recipient of more burbs in coming months. Instead of trying to appeal to adults with more topical and in-

depth news fare, the network is aggressively targeting the 18-34 demographic with youth-oriented and comedy programming. With a new campaign with the slogan "We Got It," the network is putting much of its energy into promoting "UnReal," a new music show that will showcase African American music scenes, fashions and celebrities.

Lydia N. Cole, BET's vice president of programming, is far from bowled when responding to criticism against the network, the perception that BET missed an opportunity to take advantage of the Simpson publicity and life after Gordon.

"There is not another network that is charged with caring for an entire ethnic population," Cole said in an interview here last weekend as BET officials unveiled their fall schedule to the Television Critics Association. "It's impossible to deliver everything that everyone wants. The criticism is really unfair and very narrow in perspective."

Cole added: "We are designed to be an entertainment network, and that is what our mission is. We are very much aware that targeting the 18-34 audience is not a decision that will be embraced entirely by older African Americans. But this is a business, and we have to compete with the Warner Bros. Network, UPN, Fox. The Simpson interview and its genre really falls into the

smaller area of what we do."

Also, Cole said, when the network has responded with more topical programming, such as expanding news coverage or its "Teen Summit" discussion program, those same critics who blasted the lighter fare failed to support the more serious program.

"For us to have capitalized on this attention would have meant taking a step back and coming up with a new strategy for the whole network," she said. "That was just too drastic."

As for the Simpson interview, Cole said, "Something like that only comes along once in a lifetime. In the media frenzy, not BET, did drive the story. We were not doing anything really special. It was business as usual for us, and it went back to business as usual when it was over."

David Honig, executive director of the Minority Media Telecommunications Council, a media advocacy group, said that BET was being unfairly criticized in the wake of Simpson.

Said Honig: "Yes, BET could have capitalized and gone the tabloid route, but they chose not to, with Simpson-or-any-other-story. Yes, they got a big publicity bump, but that doesn't boost long-term advertising. They would have had to have a story like that happen every month to get a bump. It just is not done."

# 'CBS Reports' visits Castro

NEW YORK (AP) — Dan Rather and his "CBS Reports" colleagues have outdone themselves with "The Last Revolutionary," an absorbing look at Cuban president Fidel Castro and the revolution that thrust him into office four decades ago.

For this one, Rather & Co. scored quite a "get"; Castro himself, who welcomed them to Cuba this spring and spent some 30 hours with the CBS correspondent over a three-day period. It was by no means Rather's first encounter with Castro; but quite likely was his richest.

"We got a good look behind the beard," Rather said recently, "the ego and enigma. What you have here — we know and he knows — is a man who's in the twilight. He'll be 70 in August. He was certainly very candid about his hearing the clock ticking."

Speaking with barely disguised pride of the program, which airs at 10 p.m. EDT Thursday, Rather explained that the Cuban leader "knew what we were going to do: a one-hour documentary, prime time, (aired) in the United States at a critical time for Fidel Castro. He gave us time and access, and he really put himself into it."

"They revisit the revolution — literally — Castro takes Rather, and us, to the Sierra Maestra mountains, where the uprising began that would end the corrupt reign of dictator Fulgencio Batista.

Castro and Rather walk the beach of the Bay of Pigs, where, 35 years ago, the United States mounted an invasion with an army of Cuban exiles in what would be only the first U.S. attempt to oust Castro. This humiliating failure would terminate his fall would push him into the

arms of the Soviet Union and bring the world to the precipice of nuclear conflict.

A man both loved and despised, hailed as a savior of the people and damned as a cold-blooded killer, Castro concedes to Rather human flaws. Then, through an interpreter, he hastens to add, "in political terms ... I can assure you that I am a man of integrity, a man of firmness, the same as the saints are."

But "The Last Revolutionary" doesn't stop with his Rather-Castro tete-a-tete, as remarkable — and illuminating — as it is. Instead, the program ambitiously uses its Castro-granted access as an opportunity to go much further in exploring what he's accomplished, and failed to accomplish, as a fixture on the world's political stage.

"To that end, we hear from a diverse group of witnesses, including Castro's college friends and family members.

We hear from former Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, who frankly acknowledges a bungled U.S. foreign policy toward Cuba — and American attempts to assassinate Castro "over a period of years."

And the program locates three of our fellow U.S. countrymen who as teenagers joined Castro's rebel band to help fight the revolution — "We see them in footage from a 1957 'CBS Reports' and meet them today.

Then, as if from an episode of "This Is Your Life," we watch them revisiting Havana for the first time in a generation — and, at his invitation, paying a call on the man they once served.

"I would die for the man today!" one of the men declares.

Now, as Castro moves into his seventies, he faces further tightening of a U.S.-imposed economic blockade against

Cuba, intended, at long last, to bring about his fall.

"The Soviet Union that poured billions into his country no longer exists."

According to Rather, Castro doesn't even smoke cigars anymore — "in deference, he says, to his staff."

"We first meet Castro returning to the Sierra Maestra, which Rather describes as 'cradle of the Cuban revolution.' He recalled a wistful moment there with Castro before the cameras got rolling.

"He had what I would describe as a thousand-

yard stare, looking way off," Rather recalled. "I said, 'What are you thinking?'"

"And he replied, 'I wish that time would stand still!'"

"But that's not time's way," He smiled and said, "True."

Rather paused to let that sink in.

"I've been with Fidel Castro 10 or 12 times going back 20 years, and I had never spoken English with me. I said, 'Well, shall we walk and talk?' He said, 'OK.'"

"I knew then that this was not going to be just another time with Castro. And it wasn't."

# NBC to use the Olympics to boost its programming

They have been called the world's biggest billboard, and to be perfectly cross about it, that's exactly what they are. A series of Olympic Games are one glorious, winner-take-all opportunity to sell products, products, products.

But when these Games get under way Friday, viewers will see for themselves that NBC — employing that age-old network maxim that no good opportunity should go unexploited — will use this 172-hour billboard extravaganza from Atlanta to sell TV, TV, TV.

We're not talking here about the usual run-of-the-mill promotional spots for prime-time shows that will be strewn throughout the telecast. We are talking instead about the launch of a brand-new cable service — "World News Tonight with NBC's 'World News Tonight.'"

Never before in the television history of the Olympics has the host network milked these games as NBC is about to. Before you get all huffy about it — "Oh, that's not in the spirit of the Olympics," consider that this is very much in the spirit of the Olympics, at least since 1968 when Roone Arledge and ABC Sports turned them into TV's most prestigious advertising event.

The Olympics, explains Bob Myers, NBC's senior vice president in charge of interactive media, "is a unique programming opportunity that is exclusive to NBC for now — it will be the focus of the world, the focus of media attention (over the next two weeks) ... It will be hard to

miss those five rings."

Yet, for NBC, pitfalls lurk. Foremost, there is the obvious problem of confusing viewers. With so much crammed on the plate in front of them — Web sites, a new network, even a CD-ROM — will they simply ignore it all? And what about cannibalization?

MSNBC's Olympic Web site will directly compete with NBC.com's elaborated site. And remember that super-duper promotional devices often fall flat. Four years ago NBC and Cablevision lost an estimated \$100 million to \$150 million on a TV's first-ever pay-per-view Triplecast (aired on three separate pay-per-view channels) of the Games. And what about promoting TV shows themselves? Back in '92 NBC launched two new shows immediately in tandem with the Olympics: "The Price Is Right" and "The Price Is Right."

Readers do not need to be reminded of their ultimate fates. What's different this time? NBC executives say the future of each new venture hangs in the balance on the Olympics. This is simply a beginning. And few could argue that TV rarely, if ever, provides a more sensational launch pad. Here's a look at what to expect.

MSNBC: Monday morning, MSNBC became the first major competitor against CNN in more than 15 years. MSNBC plans to revolve around a "theme" — news days, in which several major stories (as opposed to dozens) will be covered each day. Part of the idea is to enrich the association with the Web site.

Because of the immediate limitations of MSNBC — it is now available in only 22 million homes — the Web site could be far more interesting simply because its access will be available to any Internet user. Merrill Brown, who is running the Web site's editorial operation, says, "We're excited about the

'Olympics as a way to begin to strut our stuff, but there's a part of all our brains that says it's too bad we're launching right at the Olympics, because we'll feed a little obscure. But the flip side is it's a work in progress, and everybody and his mouser will be watching."

The MSNBC Web site will pale in comparison to NBC's and the U.S. Olympic Committee's Web site, which boasts some 3,000 pages of information and facts. But for NBC this Web site is of enormous strategic importance; it represents its most elaborate site, surpassing its more modest National Basketball Association and National Football League sites. And assuming it is a hit, Myers says NBC will create literally "thousands and thousands" of new sites within five years.

INTERCAST: The Olympics will also be the launch pad for what must be one of the more unusual ventures in recent NBC history. Intercast, a co-venture with chip maker Intel, will allow people to watch the Olympics on their PCs while engaging in some interactive pursuits. The big strategic direction for NBC's new media ventures has been to toward the so-called convergence of TV with the personal computer. Nothing to date has symbolized this strategy more completely than Intercast. After three years of development, Intel created a chip as an experiment to see if PC users would use their machines instead of a TV set. What Intel was missing, of course, was content.

The new meat of any TV viewer's diet, hit TV shows. As an experiment, NBC agreed to test Intercast — which has limited availability right now — with the police drama "Homicide: Life on the Street" and a new program this fall (perhaps "Dateline NBC"). With "Homicide," episode viewers/users will be able

to sift through onscreen documents that relate to a particular case or suspect while the show's in progress. It's unclear whether fans will like this gimmick or merely find it annoying. Likewise, with the Olympics, users will be able to watch an event and simultaneously score it with the judges.

"NIGHTLY NEWS": Will the 1996 Olympics telecast help "NBC Nightly News With Tom Brokaw" — sagging in second or third place in the evening news race during this decade — finally reach No. 1? Our prediction: Absolutely.

For more than a decade the NBC News division has struggled with a self-image that began deteriorating the day General Electric took it over. The news division has fought back and is now on the verge of making good.

Over the last few weeks, "Nightly" and top-rated "World News Tonight" have been virtually tied in the number of total viewers (almost 9 million viewers on average each weeknight). However, several weeks ago "Nightly" began to surpass "World News" in ratings for viewers between the ages of 25 and 54, a demographic that ABC has dominated for the last seven years. If NBC's "Nightly" can maintain its hold on the 25-to-54 set, then it will be the new champ. That's where the Olympics come in. "Nightly" will originate from Atlanta over the next two weeks, cleverly taking advantage of the huge audience.

"TODAY": The "Today" show is already the top-rated morning news program, but executive producer Jeff Zucker calls the Olympics on the "cake." Today will spend two weeks in Atlanta and is likely to benefit mightily from the proximity to the Games.
