# Maimed farm worker able to walk

**SALT LAKE CITY** - While the Idaho farmworker who lost three limbs last year lay unconscious and in critical condition at University Hospital, some questioned keeping a man so maimed alive.

But when Javier Tellez Juarez regained consciousness, he never once considered giving up. He had a new-born daughter and a wife who needed him.

With the help of a prosthetic leg and one mechanical arm, Tellez is walking around and able to feed himself. He writes letters to his family in Mexico, dotes on his 11-month-old daughter and is hoping to learn a trade.

While watching Tellez walk down a sidewalk Monday outside University Hospital, spokesman John Dwan said, "People have asked the question, 'Shouldn't he have been allowed to die?' This is the reason he shouldn't

have been allowed to die. Just look at him!"

Tellez was working on a 400-acre dairy farm near Malta to support his wife, Norma, 23, and newborn daughter Christina when he was injured Dec. 13.

He was using his feet to push a mechanical post-hole digger deeper into the ground when his shirt became entangled in a bar that rotates the digger. Both his arms were ripped off at the shoulder socket and his legs snapped and twisted. Physicians were forced to amputate his left leg above the knee.

Because Tellez was an undocumented worker, he was not eligible for state or federal aid. Idaho farmworkers at that time were exempted from coverage by workers' compensation.

Administrators for the Idaho catastrophic fund, who originally balked at paying a substantial part of Tellez's \$500,000 medical bill, have since paid about \$325,000 to University Hospital.

Tellez's two attorneys have filed suit against the owners of the farm where he was injured, as well as the manufacturer of the post-hole digger he was using when he was injured. Any money he wins will be garnished to cover the remainder of his medical costs.

Since the accident, 24 physicians have cared for Tellez and he began rehabilitation in March. The left prosthetic arm and leg he was fitted with were donated by the company that manufactures them.

# No PARKING

## Filer meat cutter has bone to pick with mayor

**FILER** - You can't fight the mayor, says Filer meat cutter Twila Knutson.

On a Thursday in late July, Knutson asked Mayor Russell Sheridan to stop parking for hours in the 15-minute parking space in front of her warehouse, next to City Hall. She needed the space to load her truck, she said.

The next day, she was incensed. The 15-minute parking sign was gone. In its place was a blue handicapped parking sign, which meant the mayor could continue to park there but she could not.

"When you're the mayor, you can do anything," she said. "It's the closest to the door (of City Hall) and that's where he wants to park."

Sheridan, who has a handicapped parking tag and walks with a cane, insists he had nothing to do with the parking space changes. The city had planned to convert the space six months ago, he said, because the other street bordering City Hall sloped too steeply. The timing was left up to the city maintenance director.

"The mayor parks there so people assume it's for the mayor," he said. "That's not so. If I wanted a space out there I'd get a sign that said 'elected officials'."

He had no idea that the maintenance director, Buddy Compher, planned to change the parking designation, he said, until he saw Compher working on it. Compher could not be reached for comment.

It was a sudden change, without the widening and curb cuts required by law. Activists for the disabled would, no doubt, scream over it. It's no wider than any of the other 35 spaces on the street, with no room for a wheelchair to maneuver.

Restriping and curb cutting will begin next week, Sheridan said.

Why was it so imperative to change the parking designation before it fully complied with the law, a move that state traffic engineer George Oberle says could

open the city up to lawsuits?

Sheridan said it wasn't because Knutson complained.

"You sit there in that office and get tired watching people struggle," he said. "Filer has a lot of older people. I would say 50 percent of the residents are in their 80s. It's difficult for these older people to get around."

The parking space quibble is the latest in a string of disagreements between the two.

Two years ago, the City Council changed the zoning to prevent Knutson

from expanding her business on Main Street. Knutson refused to cut Sheridan's meat.

Knutson is convinced that Sheridan ordered police officers to single her out for parking infractions and took photos as evidence. Sheridan says Knutson is too nipicky.

Knutson said Sheridan is trying to control her.

"It's just a thing that he's going to show his authority," she said.

Sheridan shrugged his shoulders. "I guess it's pick on the mayor day," he said.

# Dole says 'I'm ready to go!'

**SAN DIEGO** - The band played the theme from "Rocky" and 1,990 delegates chanted cheers of encouragement Thursday night as Bob Dole declared "I'm ready to go!"

Accepting the GOP nomination, he confronted three issues often used against him: age, disposition and a proclivity to compromise.

Dole, the oldest major-party candidate ever nominated for the presidency, made a grand entrance to the Republican National Convention, moving smartly through a sea of delegates, shaking outstretched hands along the way.

Delighted delegates waved signs proclaiming "Bob Rocks the House." His vanquished primary rivals sat with his wife, Elizabeth, in a VIP booth in the rear of the hall.

"This is a big night for me. I'm ready, I'm ready to go," he said.

He entered immediately after delegates watched a seven-minute video — shunned by the major commercial networks — highlighting Dole's life, particularly his early days in Kansas.

Dole offered himself as a "bridge" between generations, both in the video and in his speech.

"I was born in 1923, facts are better than dreams and good presidents and good candidates don't run from the truth," the 73-year-old candidate proclaimed. "Age has its advantages."

He also sought to cast in the best possible light a testy side of his personality, which sometimes comes across as mean-spirited. "If I am too combative, it is for love of country. It is to uphold a standard that I was born and bred to defend," he declared.

Yet he made several cutting references to President Clinton. "It is demeaning to the nation that within the Clinton administration a corps of the elite who never grew up, never did anything real, never sacrificed, never suf-

# In sizzling Death Valley, heat becomes the way of life

You think it was hot in Los Angeles at 96 degrees?

Or San Diego at a humid 86? Or Salt Lake City at 97? Try 122 degrees and holding — for months on end.

That's the norm this time of year on the floor of Death Valley, the hottest spot in the nation Thursday, and on nearly every day during the summer.

To those elsewhere in the West who have been suffering from a stubborn

heat wave that is starting to break, Death Valley National Park Ranger Roger Brandt has some advice: "When life puts you in the oven, do some cooking!"

For people with a heat wave of life, a little optimism goes a long way. That and a good hat, a lot of sunscreen, water, juice and an air conditioner in home, office and car.

At some point, with the right outlook, supplies and equipment, you just might

get used to it.

"You take it as it comes," said Brandt, who lives in Death Valley with his wife, a school teacher in the two-room schoolhouse. "In the evening, we get the hoses out. The kids come down the street. We squirt them, they squirt us, and nobody gets uptight about getting wet."

Coping with the heat is the way of life for many in the West. While it was in the 90s and low 100s in many Western cities —

cooler than recent days but still miserable for many residents — temperatures elsewhere soared.

On Thursday, the forecast called for temperatures of 111 in Las Vegas, 106 in Phoenix, 108 in St. George, Utah, and 109 in Palm Springs, Calif.

Officer Don Woelke of the California Highway Patrol station in Needles said that it was 102 degrees when he was driving to work the other day — at 6:30 in the morning.

"You learn to do the things you need to do to survive," he said.

# Party lieutenants direct delegates

## Reactions are orchestrated

SAN DIEGO (AP) — On television it looks like spontaneous bursts of unorchestrated enthusiasm.

Usually, the delegates are told — by a cadre of Republican convention floor lieutenants called whips — when to stand and when to sit, when to shout and when to stop.

"I know it seems a little organized," says one whip, Andrew Scott, a Maryland delegate. "But the effect has been wonderful."

At a meeting of the delegates, Mr. Scott addressed her troops: "My job is, I'm in charge of the spontaneous reactions. And you are doing a great job."

These "spontaneous reactions" are so precisely timed that the convention schedule allotted three minutes, not a second more, for celebrating when Bob Dole went over the top in Wednesday night's runoff.

Over in the 15-member Maine delegation, whip Carolyn Murray of Cumberland explained her duties this way: "I lead the clapping and the whooping and the cheering. Basically I am the leader of the pep rally."

Mrs. Murray let slide a secret: Planning TV cameras in the aisles, she said, convention managers keep unnecessary delegates.

"If they think we're looking sleepy or are not paying attention and need a reminder, they call the communications whip and tell him," she said. "It's easy to get distracted."

They know if we're not focusing. How often might a call from on high come in the course of an evening?

"Four or five times last night," said Mrs. Murray. Delegations near the podium, those most likely to be caught by the network cameras, are watched especially closely.

Whips wear brightly colored hats — yellow, orange or lime. (Although Virginia whip Anna Lee refuses to wear hers. "These hats don't do a thing for me.")

The whips in charge of enthusiasm are called "rally whips" but call themselves "cheerleader whips." Others are communications whips and running whips, who carry messages if electronics fail. Delegations communicate with convention central by phone or computer.

South Carolina Whip Henry McCaster of Columbia said his job was easy. "This crowd is pretty hot."

As far as he could figure out, the main thing is to wear this hat.

# First-ever presidential convention for Greens

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The Green Party is gathering at its first-ever presidential convention — a low-budget affair sandwiched between the piles of the GOP and Democratic conventions — to nominate Ralph Nader.

"We're not trying to make it the best TV show on earth," like the \$100-million GOP gathering in San Diego or upcoming Democratic National Convention in Chicago, said Doug Heller, media coordinator for the four-day "Green Gathering '96" which opened Thursday.

"There won't be any hoopla that could hurt the environment at this convention, being produced for less than \$25,000."

"We don't want balloons, the phisic, the banner," Heller said.

Still, he promised "an upbeat experience."

The convention's 350 citizen-activists can attend seminars like "Green Alternatives in a Consumer Society" and "Eco-Feminism," in lecture halls and laboratories on UCLA's campus. The nominating session is to be held Monday.

Nader, 62, a reluctant standard-bearer, is this year's un-candidate.

Unlike major party candidates, the consumer activist won't run television ads, take contributions or spend more than \$5,000 of his own money, although supporters spend heavily on statewide petition drives. Nader is depending on free media coverage to spread his message.

## Perot offer declined

DALLAS (AP) — Ross Perot turned down U.S. Rep. Murray Kappert's bid to be his running mate on the Reform Party ticket, but the Ohio Democrat turned down the offer and plans to stay in Congress.

Kappert talked with Perot on July 25 and the Texas billionaire asked her then to fill the vice presidential slot, but she told Perot on Tuesday that she was not interested.

In a statement from Kappert released by her office Thursday, she declined to answer the question. Perot had made the offer, but said of reports about it, "I am surprised and honored to be the subject of so much speculation."

# Buoyed by convention, Dole still behind

SAN DIEGO — Bob Dole's tax-cut plan is in place, the choice of Jack Kemp as running mate added a badly needed job of energy and Republican activists are unfettered coming out of this week's harmonious national convention.

Even before the 73-year-old Dole stepped to the podium for his acceptance speech, Republicans boasted of a job well done this week. For all their self-congratulation, though, the GOP ticket starts well behind in state after state as it heads into a 12-week effort to topple President Clinton.

In an interview with The Associated Press this week, Kemp said he was confident Dole would leave his San Diego convention in a competitive race with Clinton "and then we will have a barn burner of a campaign."

One Georgia delegate offered a more sobering assessment. "There's a lot of work ahead," said Shirley Russell, "but that's what it's all about."

Some, but not all, of the poll numbers suggest that the gap with Clinton and the Democrats may be narrowing after several days of carefully controlled speechmaking from the convention podium.

That's unlikely to last long, though, because in 10 days, Clinton and his party will hold their own nominating convention in Chicago. They, too, will probably get a surge in public opinion when they lay out their counterclaims — the 10 million new jobs created in the last four years, a world at peace, the alleged excesses of the Republican Congress thwarted by the Democrat in the White House.

The president's campaign offered a preview with a new television commercial beginning to air as Republicans were wrapping up their convention.

"If it were Bob Dole sitting here, he would have already cut Medicare \$270 billion dollars. Toxic polluters off the hook," says the announcer, with a picture of the Oval Office on the screen.

"President Clinton stood firm and defended our values. But next year, if New Gingrich controls Congress and his partner, Bob Dole, enters the Oval Office, there'll be nobody there to stop them."

To limit the erosion, the Dole campaign is preparing to air commercials beginning next week in its first sizeable advertising buy since it began bumping up against federal primary campaign spend-

ing limits in March. Kemp is expected to campaign in Chicago sometime during the week of the Democratic National Convention.

Republicans also apparently intend to take on independent presidential candidate Ross Perot directly. "This guy's ego is out of control," Rep. John Boehner, a member of

the House congressional leadership said in a recent interview. Four years ago, Perot gained 19 percent of the vote and gravely damaged George Bush's re-election campaign. "We didn't stand up and tell the American people he (Perot) was nuts," said Boehner.

"There's no doubting the magnitude of the task confronting Republicans."

A new statewide survey in Indiana taken before the convention began points to a close race — in a state that hasn't voted for a Democrat for president since Lyndon Johnson in 1964. Former Vice President Dan Quayle, who once represented the state in the Senate, looked surprised Wednesday night when the survey results were relayed to him.

"That's not going to happen," he responded quickly amidst the tumult of the convention floor. "He's not going to lose Indiana."

He may not, but even so, it serves as an excellent metaphor for the campaign. Clinton has plans to campaign in Indiana as close to his convention in Chicago, signaling that at this point in the campaign, at least, he's carrying his candidacy into solidly Republican regions.

Paul Helmke, GOP mayor of Fort Wayne and a delegate at Dole's convention, expressed confidence about Dole's ultimate success in Indiana, as well. "Obviously for the party," though, he volunteered that the margin of victory might not be enough to propel other Republicans to victory further down the ticket.

Like others, Helmke said the selection of Kemp had helped bring a needed burst of energy to a party that needed it. "Kemp did excite me," he said. Prior to the Kemp announcement, "I did wonder about spending a week out here," Helmke allowed.

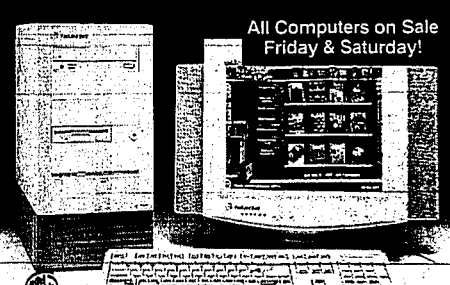

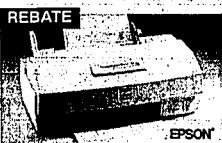

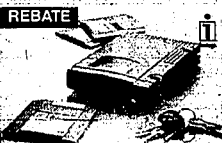

# Judge gives defendant tips on picking up men, angering organizations

CLEVELAND (AP) — A judge gave Katie Nemeth some free advice before accepting her guilty plea: Dump your boyfriend, show your legs and find a doctor in a hurry.

"Men are easy," Common Pleas Judge Shirley Strickland Saffold said to Nemeth. "You can go sit in the bus stop, put on a short skirt, cross your legs and pick up 25. Ten of them will give you their money."

She didn't stop there.

"If you don't pick up the first 10," the judge said, "then all you got to do is open your legs a little bit and cross them at the bottom and then they'll stop."

Two national organizations Thursday called the remarks sexist and insulting to men and women: Saffold made the comments Monday in fining the 19-year-old Nemeth \$200 for misusing a credit card. Nemeth had pleaded guilty. Her lawyer, Terry Gilbert, said Nemeth had worked in a

store where a customer lost a credit card, and Nemeth's boyfriend used it. He later repaid the owner. According to a transcript of the hearing, the judge told Nemeth she should break up with her boyfriend because "all of the women in prisons across these United States of America are there because of a guy." Nemeth said she wasn't with the boyfriend anymore, so Saffold suggested she go to a nearby medical school and "marry a doctor. Lucky split."

"All you got to do is take a biology book, don't even read it," the judge said. "When one of them walks by say, 'Excuse me, could you tell me what this means?' You got yourself a date."

The 45-year-old Saffold, who was elected in 1994, is married to a doctor.

Gilbert said he was shocked by Saffold's words.

"I thought it was inappropriate for a judge to suggest to a woman defendant

that the way to get ahead is to find a man — and to do that by exposing your sexuality as opposed to your mind," he said.

Nemeth does not have a telephone listing.

Saffold did not return calls Thursday. She told The Plain Dealer on Wednesday her remarks were taken out of context and denied urging Nemeth to marry or pick up a doctor, even though it appears in the transcript.

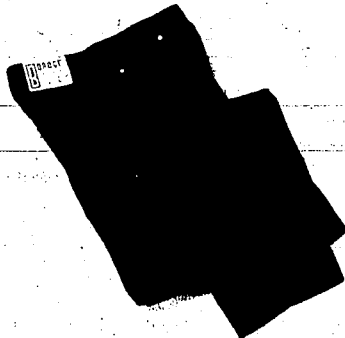

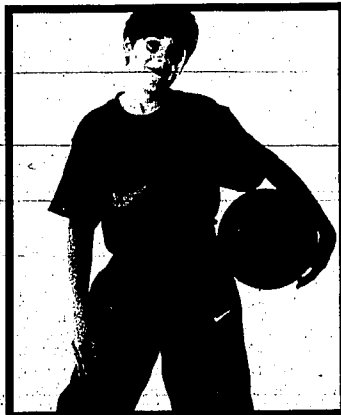

### California offers case study in big government

Funny how the terms "California government" and "wretched excess" seem to go together.

The latest outrage, as reported by the San Diego Union-Tribune, comes from the Golden State's \$8 billion worker's compensation system. This bureaucracy handles a whopping 250,000 claims a year - or one claim for every 100 Californians.

Seems the system isn't just for the lunch-bucket crowd. It's also for retired millionaire football and baseball players, hundreds of whom have claimed lump-sum, tax-free benefits.

"I can't imagine they should care what the public thinks because they have an absolute right to it," attorney Ben Mix, formerly with the San Diego Chargers, told the newspapers. "They are workers like everybody else."

Yep, regular working stiffs. For about six months of work each year, former quarterback Joe Montana was paid \$3.25 million by the San Francisco 49ers. If our math is correct, that's \$171,105 a game. And like most professional athletes, Montana was paid whether he played or not.

"Joe is pretty beat up," said his lawyer, George Hill, who would not reveal how much Montana is seeking in benefits. "He's had 10 or 15 surgeries on his back, knees and elbows."

Of course, Hill neglected to point out that most of those medical costs were paid by health insurance, provided by the 49ers along with a generous

NFL pension.

Why be concerned about Montana's worker's comp claim? Because every dime that he collects will mean higher worker's comp taxes for California employers, and fewer jobs as a result.

So it's useful to remember what worker's comp was supposed to be about in the first place.

The system was intended to protect workers with dangerous jobs and their families from ruin - folks like Javier Tellez-Juarez, the Mexican farm worker who lost two arms and a leg in an accident in Cassia County last year.

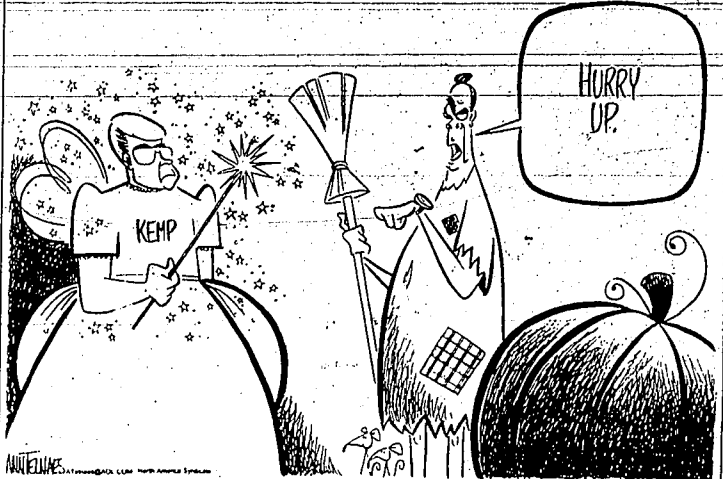
Tellez's plight prompted the Idaho Legislature to include farmworkers in coverage this year. Sadly, he won't get a nickel of worker's comp because he wasn't covered when the accident occurred.

But Joe Montana probably will - thanks to the generosity of California state government.

It's a useful lesson for other states tempted to believe that whatever the problem, government can fix it.

In the Golden State, it's a government dominated by lawyers and threats of litigation, by powerful special-interest groups and the culture of entitlement.

Most Californians have long since lost touch with Sacramento. So should anybody be surprised that their government sometimes loses touch with reality?



### Newt's definition of freedom gritty as hot sand

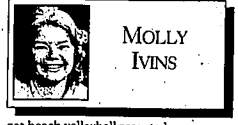

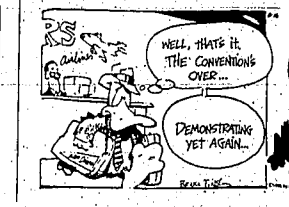

### Pope skips mass, goes to hospital for tests

CASTEL GANDOLFO, Italy — In his latest bout with poor health, Pope John Paul II canceled his celebration of an early morning Mass Thursday, hours after being hurried to a hospital with an abdominal illness.

He did make an appearance later in the day, but sounded tired and weak as he wished pilgrims gathered in the courtyard of his summer palace a happy holiday in several languages.

Aug. 15 is the church's Feast of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary and is also an Italian national holiday.

On Wednesday night, the pope was taken to a hospital for a CT scan to determine if his illness was connected to a benign bowel tumor removed in 1992, a Vatican spokesman, the Rev. Ciro Benedini, told The Associated Press.

### Sarajevo gives Christopher hero's welcome

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Shaking hands and sweeping small children into his arms, Secretary of State Warren Christopher basked in "this summer of hope" Thursday as the liberated people of Sarajevo poured into the streets to give him a hero's welcome.

"Bravo, Christopher!" exclaimed a burly man in a T-shirt as he clapped the secretary of state on the back.

Making his first visit to Sarajevo in six months, Christopher celebrated in Sarajevo in six months, Christopher celebrated signs of returning normalcy in the scarred Bosnian capital and plugged hard for a big turnout in elections scheduled for mid-September.

### Russia launches communications satellite

MOSCOW — Russia launched a communications satellite Thursday from the Plesetsk Cosmodrome in the Russian Far North.

A Molniya-M booster rocket carried the Molniya-IT satellite up at 2:21 a.m. Moscow time, the Interfax news agency reported.

The satellite, launched by the defense and communications ministries, is intended for long-range telephone communications, the report said.

It was the 200th successful launch of the Molniya-class rocket since the series began in 1970, Interfax said.

### Missing Norwegian rowers found, rescued

ABERDEEN, Scotland — Two Norwegians who tried to row across the North Sea were picked up by a fishing vessel Thursday.

The two men were "distrressed and dehydrated" when they were rescued by the crew of the FV Helene, a fishing trawler, about 85 miles east of the Shetland Islands, the Coast Guard said.

The pair's 19-foot boat was found earlier Thursday by the Norwegian coast guard.

The two adventurers set out from Karmoy in southwestern Norway on Aug. 7 to row 250 miles across the cold and often turbulent North Sea to the Shetland Islands.

They were reported missing Saturday after failing to make planned radio contact with an oil rig.

# Students clash with Korean police

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — Helicopters poured tear gas on demonstrators and 6,000 police raided their university campus Thursday, the fourth day of clashes between police and students calling for reunification with communist North Korea.

The clashes broke out as South Korean President Kim Young-sam renewed his offer of massive economic aid to North Korea if the impoverished country agrees to peace talks.

But Kim's gesture went unnoticed at Yonsei University, where a dozen helicopters rained yellow tear gas solution on a crowd of about 7,000 students who had gathered for an illegal pro-unification rally supported by North Korea.

More than 500 students and police have been injured in four days of clashes. About 600 students have been detained.

The students demand reunification with North Korea and the removal of 37,000 U.S. troops stationed in South Korea, which they claim are hindering reconciliation between the two countries. They also support two-way peace talks between North Korea and the United States that would exclude South Korea.

On Thursday, police used ex-

vators and trucks to tear down the steel gates of the university, an elite institution known for anti-government activism.

The students fought back, beating police with heavy metal pipes and throwing stones and firebombs. Bricks and broken glass littered the main campus thoroughfare, where tires, desks and chairs smoldered.

Dozens of students were seen limping, and many were bleeding. One student wiped blood from his face as he repeatedly swung at police with a steel pipe.

Police raided the campus twice. During one raid, 100 riot police were overpowered and pummeled by angry students. Several were beaten unconscious, while 30 were held hostage and

stripped of their padded fatigues, helmets, shields and clubs before being freed.

More injuries were avoided when police decided against raiding the science building where 1,000 students were holed up. The students, who had threatened to set a propane gas tank on fire if police entered the building, hurled rocks, firebombs and laboratory equipment from the roof.

About 5,000 students fled from the school, which was blanketed in a dense fog of acrid tear gas.

The latest crackdown reflects the government's determination to stop campus activism. Student protests, which flourished under past military governments, have lost public support under Kim, South Korea's first civilian leader in 32 years.

In a speech marking Korea's Independence Day on Thursday, Kim renewed his offer of economic aid to North Korea, conditional on acceptance of four-way peace talks involving the United States, China and the two Koreas.

"I believe that when the four-party meeting is held, North Korea will be able to benefit from political stability, military trust and economic profits," he said.

## Goldhagen's holocaust book sells out 1st print run in just 1 week

BERLIN (AP) — American author Daniel Goldhagen's book reexamining the Holocaust is a hit with summer readers, who bought out the first press run of the German translation in one week.

Bookstores have sold out of the first 40,000 copies of "Hitler's Willing Executioners," which went on sale Aug. 7. The Siedler publishing house is rushing out another 30,000 copies and has stockpiled paper to print more, spokeswoman

Gisela Niklas said Thursday.

A heated debate among German historians that began with the book's U.S. release in March has pigged reader interest in Germany.

Goldhagen, a 36-year-old professor at Harvard University,

argues that ordinary Germans willingly participated in the extermination of 6 million Jews, and that they were motivated less by Nazi ideology than by a form of anti-Semitism peculiar to Germany.

Some German historians have

argued that Goldhagen presents no new research and manipulates facts.

The book was a bestseller in the United States, where more than 125,000 copies have been sold, according to the publisher, Alfred A. Knopf, Inc.

# Highway patrol: Montana speed limit imprecise, but it exists

## 'Reasonable and prudent' rule still is law

HELENA, Mont. (AP) — Montana Highway Patrol officer Mitch Tuttle says he's not sure if a shiny new Chrysler with Alberta plates, cruising toward the Canadian border at 87 mph.

It wasn't a clear violation of Montana's daytime speed law, which specifies only a "reasonable and prudent" speed for conditions. But with a sharp crosswind whipping across the highway, the car was going fast enough for Tuttle to question whether the speed was legal.

"And when the car finally was pulled to the interstate shoulder, it was not the first time that Tuttle heard the indignant protest — this time from driver Bill Mowen of Calgary, Alberta: "Montana has no speed limit."

With summer tourists by the thousands driving Montana highways, patrol officers are finding many people don't understand that Montana's speed law may be imprecise, but it definitely exists.

"A lot have read that Montana has no speed limit," Tuttle said. "People think every day's a good day to drive fast."

In fact, Tuttle said, some days are just bad days for speed; the weather is one factor he considers in deciding whether a speed is "reasonable and prudent." Traffic, highway design, the age and condition of the car, even tire wear — they all can enter into the decision.

If the trooper decides it's a violation, the fine can run from \$70 to \$500, many times the old \$5 penalty, typically, imposed when Montana had federally mandated limits of 65 mph on interstate highways, and 55 on two-lane routes.

Those tickets didn't go on a driver's record, either. The new ones do.

Mowen got only a warning ticket and a friendly talk about the law in Montana. Fifteen Mercedes-Benz test drivers got more, \$70 tickets in late July for driving about 100 mph in a convoy on Interstate 90 near Billings. Some of the cars were prototypes.

The planned nature of the viola-

tion didn't sit well with some state officials.

"I think it shows a real lack of respect, not only for the law in Montana, but for the rights and safety of Montana drivers and tourists from other states and countries," said Attorney General Jay Mansack. "Even if these were professional drivers, not everyone on the road was."

Col. Craig Reap, commander of the Highway Patrol, has received calls from a Corvette club and other groups asking if they could come here to drive fast. Tuttle heard from a French tire maker who wanted to run tests at 140 mph.

"I told him that's not what we consider reasonable and prudent," he said.

The state is trying to let people know about Montana's law in a \$20,000 campaign with the key-stone message: "When, Dude." Using billboards, posters, flyers, bumper stickers and ads on TV and radio, it is aimed mainly at out-of-state motorists.

"I think that from the beginning, the citizens of Montana had a fair understanding of what this law was about," Reap said. "The reason I get that is the highest-speed vehicles are out-of-state. What I see, when I'm out driving in my personal

car, indicates the same thing."

The figures do suggest speeding is up. From January through June, the Highway Patrol issued 2,094 warnings and 3,622 tickets for violations of the "reasonable and prudent" standard. During the same period in 1995, the figures were 927 warnings and 1,823 citations.

Most people do not appear to be lawbreakers, however. State Traffic Safety Administrator Al Goke said that for 95 percent of the drivers in Montana, average speeds are about 75 mph on interstates and 65 mph on two-lane highways. That's only about 2 mph faster than under the old speed limits.

But many among the other 15

percent are really ripping, Goke said. Tuttle agrees, saying that cars topping 100 mph, once seen four or five times a year, now are fairly common.

"Now it's easy to see one a week," he said. "Sometimes, you see two or three in a shift."

Goke said it is too early to confirm that accidents are rising because of the new speed law, but he believes it is happening.

"It takes awhile for it to show in a statistical way, but I'm sure it will, over time," he said.

Accidents are up, but they were rising in 1995, when crashes totaled 20,000 and just over 10,000 people were injured, Goke said. But fatalities are down slightly,

about 10 fewer than at this time last year. Montana will have posted limits in and near towns, along highway construction zones and in some other locations. There are set nighttime limits of 65 mph on interstates and 55 mph on two-lane highways. Trucks are limited to 65 and 55, day and night.

Reap wants Montana to have a specified daytime speed limit as well, but he won't recommend a number until he can review summer traffic data. The final decision will be up to the Legislature, which convenes in January.

There will be opposition. Rep. Sonny Hanson, R-Billings, is a leading supporter of the current law. With a few exceptions, Montana

highways are not crowded, he said, and he believes people should be able to cover the state's vast distances quickly, if they can do it safely.

"I think the basic rule (reasonable and prudent) works great," said the legislator, an engineer who said he drives his Buick Riviera between 85 and 90 mph on interstates.

Hanson said Montana had a higher accident rate under a speed limit of 55 mph in the 1970s, than under the 65 mph limit that took effect in 1987 and continued until last December. He also said most accidents in Montana occur at night, when the posted speed limits are in effect.

## Western sawmill production drops dramatically to 13-year low

BOISE (AP) — Sawmill production has dropped to a 13-year low in the 12 western states, but there is wide disagreement over the reason.

The industry points a finger at federal timber policies. A conservationist said the decline is due to market conditions.

In Idaho, the wholesale value of the state's lumber production declined 19 percent last year and the volume was down 11.5 percent.

The Western Wood Products Association said Idaho ranked fourth in production among the 12 states with the 1995 cut valued at \$715 million, down from \$884 million the previous year. The state's production of 1.66 billion board feet was down from 1.85 billion in 1994.

Western sawmills were caught in a squeeze between high timber costs and lower product returns, the Oregon-based association said in releasing its annual survey of more than 350 mills in the West.

The report said the region's lumber production totaled 15.77 billion board feet in 1995, 9.7 percent below the 1994 total. The volume was the lowest since 1982, when a

prolonged recession cut industry output to 13.72 billion board feet.

The estimated wholesale value of the cut was \$6.4 billion, down 19.9 percent from 1994. The average value for lumber sold was also down, falling to \$408 per thousand board feet, compared to \$460 a year earlier. It marked the third year in a row the average value has declined.

Every western state but Utah saw lower production during 1995. The most dramatic decrease was in New Mexico, where production was cut by more than half to just 85 million board feet.

"We've been seeing a lot of sawmills closing," said Carl Ringberg of the Montana Wood Products Association. "The cure is to link the federal government in the ban and get a viable timber program put together as part of their forest management plan."

But Michael Scott of the Greater Yellowstone Coalition said the real story lies in price, market conditions and foreign competition that have made logging existing sites uneconomical.

### Freight train derailed east of Glenns Ferry

**GLENN'S FERRY** - Ten cars on a Union Pacific train derailed east of Glenn's Ferry, Idaho, about two miles east of here Thursday.

Five of them ended up in the Snake River, said train company spokesman John Bromley.

The cars were carrying soda ash, a non-toxic substance used to make glass, soap and paint, Bromley said. The train had left Glenn River, Wyo., stopped in Pocatello for a crew change and derailed at 4:35 p.m.

No one was injured in the wreck. It was unclear how long the train took to get back on the road. Repair crews and ash had seeped into the river. Repair crews from Pocatello and Nampa were on their way to the scene late Thursday.

### State sets resurfacing plan for U.S. Highway 93

**SHOSHONE** - The Idaho Transportation Department has planned a resurfacing project on approximately 17 miles of U.S. Highway 93 between Shoshone and Richfield. The project begins Monday and should be completed by August 1997.

Crews will level the road to remove potholes and ruts, place a new layer of pavement on the highway and seal cost on the surface.

The project is expected to cost about \$736,000.

### Road to Pomerelle Ski Area to be widened this fall

**ALBION** - About six miles of Idaho Highway 77 through Albion and south of Albion to the road leading to the Pomerelle Ski Area will be resurfaced and widened beginning next week, according to the Idaho Transportation Department.

Crews will level and repave the cracked and rough surface of Main Street in Albion, and a major section of Main will be widened from 30 feet to 36 feet. Also, a 4.5-mile section of Idaho 77 from Albion to the Pomerelle road will be widened from 22 feet to 24 feet and overlaid with new pavement.

All work, which involves placing a layer of small gravel and liquid asphalt on the road's surface to prevent it against water and weather damage and increase traction will be done next summer.

The \$553,000 project should be completed by September. This project ties into last summer's work on Idaho 77 from Milba to Pomerelle.

## Cuts force agency to rely on local donations

**TWIN FALLS** - Edna Epper watches intently as people line up for food boxes at the South Central Community Action Agency Thursday afternoon.

About 60 people of all ages, many elderly, pick up boxes containing small bags of beans or rice, cookies, frozen potatoes and soup, according to family size. Mimos hang onto children. Seniors chat as day-old bread is placed on top of their boxes.

A senior citizen and the agency's board chairman, Epper wants Congress to ease this.

"They seem to have forgotten we have poor people out there," Epper said. "The money gets less. The needs go up. They don't understand what's going on."

She refers to decreasing federal funds

### Poverty guidelines

for agency programs serving low-income families in the Magic Valley. A food pantry, weatherization and rental and utility assistance, to name a few, all are facing funding cuts.

The action agency's board, made up of community residents, eliminated one management position and pared another to part-time this month so it wouldn't have to reduce office hours to help fami-

lies, said Director Betty Wooten.

The agency lost \$12,580 from a Community Service Block Grant for emergency food, housing and other needs to families in crisis. It was part of \$106,802 cut statewide from a \$2.1 million grant.

On average, about 350 people in the region are helped each month through the program.

The good news is the grant amount may be restored in the next budget year, Wooten said. The bad news, though, is that it's another in a string of funding wounds.

Federal dollars to help stock the agency's food pantry have fallen steadily, she said.

Two years ago, the federal commodity program stopped delivering food products, such as cheese, peanut butter and rice. During its height, 100 volunteers

gave food to 5,000 households a month, working at 13 sites in the Magic Valley, said Cyd Dillon, who administers assistance programs.

Last year, funding that provided commodities to food pantries and soup kitchens dried up, Dillon said. There was also a 25 percent pruning of Federal Emergency Management Agency dollars that helped buy food for the pantry. An emergency shelter grant for housing and food decreased to \$25,306 last year from \$29,756 the previous year.

Although federal money still buys pantry food, Community Action now depends mostly on donated goods from the community.

"Our community gives so much, all our communities," Dillon said.

Yet the largest cut was in the program

## Neighbors, friends help family in need

### 270 acres of barley harvested in less than a day with help from area residents

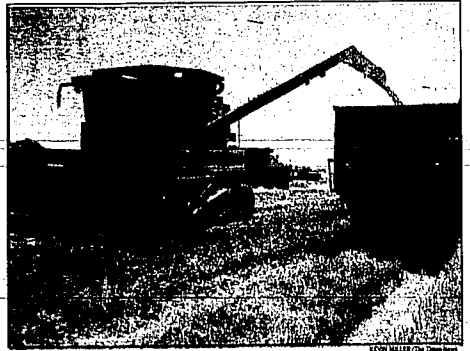
**PAID** - It's a rare occasion when 270 acres of barley can be harvested in less than a day, but with 11 combines and 45 men working together to help a family in need in Twin Falls, it's simple.

"Ralph was a good friend of ours, and when someone gets down around here, everyone helps out," Vae Starnes of Paul said. "The same thing happened to me when I was in the hospital two years ago, and now we're out here to help Ralph's family during their time of need."

Ralph Ingram, a farmer from Paul who spent the last 37 years of his life growing and selling barley on the 270-acre, well-irrigated farm, died last week at the age of 47. He is survived by his wife, Thelma, and three children, Candice, Jennifer and Riley.

Ingram was diagnosed with the kidney-related cancer two years ago, but it wasn't until last spring that his health reached a point where he couldn't farm anymore.

"We didn't expect his death to happen so soon, and I was worried how I would be able to harvest all this winter grain," said Tammy Ingram said. "But a gathering angel seemed to lead me to help Ralph's family during their time of need."

Bill met Ralph in the first grade and had been his next door neighbor ever since. He assisted him in the management of his farm last spring, and after

## Waste critics accuse opponents of violations

**BOISE** - Critics of Gov. Phil Batt's nuclear waste deal alleged campaign finance violations Thursday by the coalition of mainly eastern Idaho interests trying to mount the opposition.

Stop the Shipments, which forced a November vote aimed at voting Batt's deal, claimed Lockheed Martin Idaho Technologies Co. and Coalition For Better Energy have been actively campaigning against the initiative without filing required disclosures and financial disclosure reports.

Stop the Shipments leaders claimed Idaho's National Engineering Laboratory contractor Lockheed and its allies are spending vast sums of cash to defeat the initiative, and are trying to hide this from voters.

## Leaders claim vast sums spent to defeat measure

restricted the governor's constitutional powers.

In just 24 hours, the high court denied the request without explanation but indicated it would consider the arguments if voters adopt the Initiative on Nov. 5. The initiative will appear before Idaho voters as Proposition 3.

State campaign finance laws prohibit a campaign committee from any financial activities, until it formally appoints a treasurer.

Former state Sen. John Peavey of Carey, a leader of the anti-waste campaign, maintained the coalition filed the certificate Tuesday only because Stop the Shipments inquired about the coalition's status earlier that day.

## Suspects sought in 2 Maverick robberies

**JEROME** - Police were searching for two masked teen-agers who robbed two Maverick convenience stores at gunpoint Thursday morning.

Armed with a shotgun and baseball bat, the young men strode into the Maverick Country Store in Wendell at 2:44 a.m. and demanded money from the clerk, who was mopping floors, said Wendell Police Chief Philip Cowell.

The clerk kept his cool, walked to the front counter and handed them his cash register tray - the robbers grabbed about \$200 from the tray and fled into the night, Cowell said.

"He was pretty calm throughout this whole thing, he figured if he did what they said they weren't going to hurt him," Cowell said.

The men walked into another Maverick Country Store at 4:05 a.m. in Jerome and made similar demands to a clerk, who was coming out of the store office, said Lt. Dean Larson of the Jerome Police Department.

The clerk nervously retrieved money from the cash register; the robbers ordered her to stuff the money in a bag, but they changed their minds and ran off with the entire cash register tray, Larson said.

Police had vague descriptions of the robbers, no suspects and some footprints by Thursday afternoon. One man was short and wore a black bandanna, the other was tall and sported a red bandanna, Cowell said. They appeared dark-skinned and between the ages of 15 and 19, Cowell said.

## Public floaters ignore salmon protective regs

**STANLEY** - So many thoughtless river floaters have repeatedly violated regulations imposed to protect spawning salmon on a critical reach of the Salmon River near Stanley that the U.S. Forest Service will probably soon close the river to public float-bathers.

Sawtooth National Forest Supervisor Bill LeVere announced Thursday that it took just two days for public floaters to amass enough violations of the protective regulations that one more will result in closure of the 15-mile stretch of river from the Yankee Fork to the Sawtooth National Recreation Area boundary.

LeVere emphasized that commercial outfitters and guides have complied with the restrictions since they were imposed last weekend and will continue to serve their customers.

"Many members of the public are completely ignoring the special protection measures set up for federally listed salmon," he said. "The sad thing about this is the people who violated these restrictions did so knowingly."

Two restrictions have been ignored: The time restrictions for floating through the areas of Indian Riffles and Torrey's Hole and the requirement that free pass be obtained so floaters can be advised of the special regulations.

If the river is closed to floaters, LeVere said violators would be formally cited.

The restrictions were imposed to protect spawning beds of endangered chinook salmon. Officials say three times as many salmon have gone through that stretch of the river and reached the Sawtooth Fish Hatchery this year, compared to a year ago.

LeVere conceded that activity downstream - from commercial fishing to the

Oregon fire triples in size, destroys homes

WARM SPRINGS, Ore. (AP) — Reinforcements arrived Thursday at this Indian reservation town to battle a wildfire that destroyed five homes and forced hundreds to evacuate.

The 65,000-acre fire stranded about 300 people at a tribal resort and casino after it forced the evacuation of 150 houses and temporarily closed a 40-mile stretch of U.S. 26.

"The fire just went crazy," said Cateen Olson, spokeswoman for the state fire marshal's Emergency Response Center in Salem. "It was burning so hot and so fast it was skipping patches, and then it came back and burned over the patches."

More than half the 10,000 firefighters working major fires in seven Western states were assigned to Oregon, with at least 800 battling the fire at the Warm Springs Indian Reservation about 90 miles southeast of Portland.

The National Interagency Fire Center in Boise, Idaho, said 700 new fires were reported by Thursday morning in Oregon, California, Idaho, Montana, Utah, Washington and Wyoming — mostly small fires sparked by lightning. Fires also were burning in Nevada and Colorado.

"We got a lot of lightning all over the west," said Rose Davis, agency spokeswoman. "It's a typical summer."

She said nearly 355,000 acres had burned across the West since Aug. 8, pushing the total to 3.95

million acres for 1996. Last year, wildfires burned 1.28 million acres in the West.

About 295,000 acres burned in the past week have been in Oregon.

Most of the fires were burning sagebrush and grasses across the desert and rangeland in remote areas of the state.

The largest had burned nearly 95,000 acres near Antelope, east of the Warm Springs reservation, and a complex of four fires had spread across 47,000 acres in the southeastern corner of Oregon.

Crews near the Idaho border were having difficulty containing a fire that had burned nearly 46,000 acres along the Snake River in the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area, the nation's deepest gorge.

The fire danger eased in the tiny Eastern Oregon town of Spray, where crews estimated a 22,500-acre fire would be contained by Saturday. The fire had threatened the entire town with evacuation before it destroyed 11 homes, 13 outbuildings and 15 vehicles.

At the Warm Springs reservation, the U.S. Forest Service requested 600 more firefighters, including 200 of the highly skilled wildfire experts known as "hotshots."

Helicopters with water buckets and retardant-dropping bombs were making sorties over the fire, while other helicopters dropped incendiary pellets on some remote areas to rob the main blaze of fuel.

Firefighters estimated they had saved at least 350 homes from flames in the past two days.

The reservation's Kah-Nee-Ta resort, which has cement-faced walls and is built to withstand wildfires, was not threatened. But access to the resort and an adjacent casino was blocked by the fire, temporarily stranding guests and some evacuees.

"The swimming pool is jammed," said general manager Zuhair Jarant, chucking. "They probably had a real sense of security out there, except for the smoke."

Colorado collision of truck, car kills Idaho man, son

STRASBURG, Colo. (AP) — An Idaho man and his son were killed Thursday when a semi truck hauling a load of Jello crossed the median of Interstate 70 and collided head-on with their car.

The truck driver, David Williams, 33, of Sidney, Ohio, was held for investigation of two counts of criminally negligent homicide, Arapahoe County authorities said.

He was driving for Continental Trucking, authorities said. Killed in the 5:30 a.m. accident were a 40-year-old Idaho man and his son, who was sitting in the back seat of the family's 1987 Pontiac, Colorado State Patrol Sgt. Anthony Padilla said.

The victims' names were not released pending notification of relatives.

Two other passengers in the Pontiac, apparently the victim's stepchildren, were injured by Swedish Medical Center.

Philip Farnes, 17, remained in

critical condition with a head injury and his sister, Christine, 13, was in fair condition with an abdominal injury and a broken leg, a hospital spokeswoman said.

Padilla said the truck driver, who was not injured, apparently fell asleep at the wheel and failed to negotiate a curve in the west-bound lanes of I-70 about two miles east of Bennett.

The truck crossed the median and struck a guardrail, which pierced the fuel tank and ignited a fire in the cab. The truck was destroyed by the blaze, Padilla said.

Before coming to a stop in the middle of I-70 the truck entered the eastbound lanes and first struck a black 1995 Ford van driven by William Perrulla, 65, of Aloha, Ore.

In the van also were Pertulla's wife, Barbara, and son, William. Padilla said the collision blew out the back windows of the van and two of the occupants' clothing was set afire by the burning truck.

High court upholds lawyer

BOISE, Idaho (AP) — Once a criminal defendant is fully advised of his rights and pleads guilty to a crime, he can't argue later that his lawyer gave him bad advice, the Idaho Supreme Court says.

The court on Thursday upheld a district judge's dismissal of a legal malpractice claim filed against Boise lawyer Howard Winweiler.

Kevin Lamb pleaded guilty to felonies in livestock transactions and served about 18 months in prison.

He later filed a malpractice suit against Manweiler, claiming the lawyer wrongly advised him he could withdraw his guilty plea.

But the Supreme Court ruled unanimously that once Lamb was advised by the judge of his rights, and pleaded guilty anyway, he couldn't claim that anything that happened to him was caused by Manweiler.

Permit or not, no guns in Murray's schools, buses

MURRAY, Utah (AP) — Permits or not, employees and volunteers of the Murray School District cannot carry firearms — even fake ones — onto school property, including buses and parking lots.

Without debate and on a unanimous vote, the district board adopted the new policy Wednesday. It applies to teachers, administrators, school employees and volunteers. Those who violate the ban are subject to disciplinary action.

In addition to possible suspension and dismissal, violators also could be subject to criminal penalties, school officials said. The policy does exempt law officers, and allows educators to bring unloaded firearms to school for instructional purposes, if first approved in writing by the superintendent.

The board became concerned after published reports that a Murray High School teacher has a permit to carry a concealed weapon. Although the teacher has said he would not bring the weapon to school, board members wanted to clarify the district's stand on firearms.

Meantime, two state legislators are planning bills for the 1997 Legislature that would let schools, churches and private business owners ban concealed

weapons from their premises. Rep. Ray Short, R-Holladay, said when he sponsored his "weapons free zone" school bill several years ago, he never imagined a subsection would be interpreted to allow regular citizens with concealed weapons permits to bring their guns to school.

At the time, he believed the section applied only to law enforcement officers, he said. Gun advocates interpreted the law to mean anyone authorized to carry a concealed gun may take the firearm into schools.

Earlier this summer, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints issued a statement saying churches are places of sanctuary and that any weapons are inappropriate within their walls.

"Lockheed and their front organization obviously feel that the laws of Idaho don't apply to them," Peavey said. "They were intense on trying to deny the citizens of this state their right to vote on this issue that they decided Idaho's law applied to everyone but Lockheed."

He claimed last week's legal action by the Boise law firm also under contract to Lockheed, cost the coalition about \$50,000.

Peavey also argued that Lockheed's contract with former Democratic Gov. Cecil Andrus and former Republican Sen. James McClure is not intended only to advise the firm on strategies involving the future and image of the INEL, but is aimed at defeating the initiative as well.

That contract, handled with Lockheed's Boise law firm, could pay Andrus and McClure and two associates \$192,000 through next spring.

Ossmann said the contract is not linked to the initiative. The contract, signed on July 23, makes no mention of the initiative or the agreement.

In addition, Andrus and McClure issued a public defense of Batt's Oct. 16 nuclear waste deal on June 25. Ossmann said he understood they wrote the paper as private citizens.

Ossmann also disputed Peavey's claim that Lockheed Martin President John Denson was campaigning for the agreement and against the initiative as he traveled the state this spring and summer, speaking to local civic groups.

"It's been amazing the amount of people who jumped at the offer when you consider they're also in the middle of harvest season and how much work this involves. Ball said that today we were here for Ralph, not ourselves."

Forty-five volunteers began harvesting the fields late Thursday morning and vowed to continue until they were done. The harvest was planned for later in the evening to thank everyone for their help.

"I'm so grateful that I don't know how I'll ever be able to thank them all," Wooten said. "We baked 56 cupcakes for the occasion. "Ralph would have been thankful as well."

Using their 25-year-old combine, Tammy said it used to take her husband three to four weeks

to harvest what the volunteers accomplished Thursday. At one point, the volunteers harvested a 40-acre plot of land in less than 30 minutes.

Despite sweltering temperatures and a noticeable lack of wind Thursday afternoon, the weather proved favorable for the volunteers as the sun dried out the fields in time to begin harvesting. A high rainfall Wednesday night had some volunteers worried.

"Today was the day when all of us could finally get together and do this, and I don't know what we would have done if it hadn't dried out in time for us," said Wally Freuberg, a friend and neighbor of the Ingrams. "We lucked out though, and for that we're relieved."

More than 20 trucks from Coors Brewing Co. drove in and out of

the fields as they hauled the barley to their elevators in Burley.

In all, Ingram's fields produced a 120 bushels-per-acre yield that filled each truck with more than 600 bushels of barley. The Ingrams have been supplying the company with barley for the past 21 years.

Tammy Ingram said she will become the landlord of her husband's land after this season and rent it to someone else to farm.

The couple are also part owners of a 350-acre potato field that she says will be harvested by a custom farmer from Heyburn next month. Afterward, it will be managed by the other owners permanently.

"I can't take care of all this land myself, but we'll still be close by to watch over Ralph's fields as someone new takes over for us," Ingram said.

Action is helping families toward self-sufficiency, Dillon said. But some people just can't accomplish that because of age or other problems.

"There will always be people in crisis," she added. Standing in line for her box, Alice Wardill of Gooding says she is disabled and \$38 in food stamps each month is not just enough. The food "helps me so much."

Fay Gergens of Twin Falls is also an agency-member and eligible for the food box. She says she earns about \$600 month but \$150 goes to buy medicine. She blames Republicans for the bulk of the cuts.

"They are taking away from people who need it, really need it. All they think about is their own ideas and pocketbooks," she said. "I think it's for the birds."

# Independent, Democrat say franked material political

BOISE (AP) — Don Clarke, who says he is a political independent, complained Thursday that material sent out by Republican Rep. Helen Chenoweth at taxpayer expense this month was blatantly political.

Chenoweth, running against Democrat Dan Williams for Idaho's 1st District congressional seat, has sent out two mass mailings.

"Senior News" was sent out to 125,000 senior citizens in the district, Williams told a Boise news conference. Chenoweth's "Summer '96

Newsletter" went out to 212,098 residential addresses in the district, he said. Clarke, who moved to Idaho from Texas, said he's used to getting mail from elected officials, sent out for informational purposes at taxpayer expense. He said Chenoweth's materi-

al, which talked about her efforts on Social Security and Medicare, were pure politics.

"I know the difference," he said. "I'm a little bit angry. It's time to stop. It's being drastically abused."

Williams had a poster-sized check for \$57,500 on hand, which he urged Chenoweth to sign. That represents the amount of taxpayer expense to print and mail the Chenoweth material, he said.

Keith Rupp, Chenoweth congressional chief of staff, said Williams was exaggerating the number and cost of the materi-

al. He said 50,000 letters were sent out to senior citizens in the district and about 180,000 items went out to all households in the district.

The total cost was about \$47,000, he said.

Rupp said Chenoweth had the material reviewed beforehand to determine it was proper.

"Mrs. Chenoweth has complied with both the letter and the spirit of the law," he said. "Both newsletters were reviewed by the House Franking Committee for content to assure there was nothing

that was campaign-related.

"She has complied with the rules," Williams said technically, the Chenoweth mailings were legal, although they were not very ethical. "It is not illegal. I just think it's wrong and contrary to what she said in the last election," he said.

"It is pure political propaganda."

A law forbids candidates from mailing material at taxpayer expense 90 days before an election, Williams said, and the Chenoweth material was mailed out 91 days before the election.

"It was sent out at the last possible minute," he said. "When I'm elected, in an election year you will not see anything like this coming from Dan Williams."

Clarke said he does not belong to either party, and votes for Republican and Democratic candidates.

He said in November, he plans to vote for at least one Republican.

"But I'm going to work on this election," he said, referring to Williams.

## Nuclear boosters want to review Integral Fast Reactor project

POCATELLO (AP) — A coalition of nuclear boosters wants the Department of Energy to revive the abandoned Integral Fast Reactor research project at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory.

The group, Coalition 21, asked Energy Secretary Hazel O'Leary to assess the environmental impact of removing nuclear fuel from Argonne National Laboratory's EBR-II reactor. The group wants a revival of Argonne's research into recycling and destroying nuclear waste.

At the request of the Clinton administration, Congress in 1994 killed funding for Argonne's

Idaho-based work on the Integral Fast Reactor.

Scientists said they were about three years away from proving the reactor could generate electricity while burning up long-lived radioactive material.

Coalition 21 members say a nationwide network of such reactors could dispose of nuclear waste while producing electricity. EBR-II was the test bed for the Integral Fast Reactor project.

But because of the policy change, O'Leary ordered the 30-year-old breeder reactor decommissioned and dismantled.

Coalition 21 members contend an environmental assessment on

the upcoming defueling is required by law.

They contend that if the government studied environmental impacts of defueling EBR-II, the study would show reviving the project is an environmentally sound way of disposing of spent nuclear fuel. They say Congress' intent to bury waste in a geologic repository in Nevada is not.

"The assumption is that we can bury that spent nuclear fuel and that this is the answer. But the scientists say they can't guarantee it can be kept isolated for hundreds of thousands of years," said Dick Kinney, Coalition 21 president.

## President to meet Idahoans

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Idaho Falls residents have been flocking to the Idaho Falls Airport this week to take a look at Air Force One, President Bill Clinton's 747.

On Saturday, as the president wraps up a week-long vacation at Jackson, Wyo., they will have a chance to visit with Clinton.

Clinton will meet the public for about 45 minutes Saturday as he ends the vacation.

An area north of the airport terminal will open to the public at 3 p.m., with room for about 1,000 people, who will be let in on a first come-first served basis.

The president will appear at

about 4:15 p.m. and shake hands with the public until about 5 p.m., a White House representative said.

"Since he's there in Idaho Falls, the president thought it would be nice to actually meet people who live there," said White House spokeswoman Mary Ellen Glynn.

Clinton will probably make a few brief remarks about his trip, but won't take questions, she said.

## INEL reactor burial grounds to be capped

IDAHO FALLS (AP) — Two reactor burial grounds at the Idaho National Engineering Laboratory are being capped this summer, and the plan is to ban anything but industrial use of the land for the next 100 years.

The Department of Energy awarded a contract for \$661,000 to IT Corp., Morgantown, Pa., to cap the sites of the Stationary Low-Power Reactor-1 and Belling Water Reactor Experiment.

Each site has some radioactive soil resulting from dismantling of

nuclear reactors. A "bio-barrier" will cover buried debris at the Stationary Low-Power Reactor site, with large boulders placed on top. A 120-by-120 foot area of the Belling Water Reactor Experiment burial ground will be covered by large boulders.

Both areas previously were covered with natural materials and surrounded by fences. IT Corp. will use mostly on-site materials for the caps, including 3,000 cubic yards of gravel, 3,000 yards of cobble and 2,500 cubic yards of large boulders.

The terrain also will be contoured to direct surface water away.

IT Corp. also has a \$1.2 million contract to move 130,000 cubic yards of soil to cover three landfills previously used at INEL. The landfills at the Central Facilities Area will be covered, revegetated and monitoring wells will be installed.

Up to 1984, the landfills accepted municipal-type and industrial waste from operations at the federal research center.

## Kootenai County commissioners yank resort tax

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Deciding there is too little time to set voters, Kootenai County commissioners have backed off on a plan to put a 10-year, 1 percent local option sales tax on the November ballot.

"The timing just seemed to be off on it. We just didn't seem to have the broad support," Commission Chairman Dick Compton said Wednesday.

The Legislature last spring passed a law authorizing a 1 percent, voter-improved sales tax in

resort communities, requiring that at least half the revenue be earmarked for property tax relief.

Kootenai County and the cities of Coeur d'Alene and Post Falls lobbied the lawmakers.

The measure shot down Wednesday called for devoting 75 percent of the estimated \$12 million annual revenue to property tax relief and splitting the remainder between the county and cities based on population and point-of-sale.

"I'm not disappointed. I'm not

surprised," Coeur d'Alene Mayor Al Hassell said. "There wasn't enough information. We didn't have enough time."

"I saw that as a possible solution to our roads problem," Post Falls city administrator Jim Hammond said. "We were trying to do too much too fast."

The next shot at presenting voters with a local option sales tax will be in May.

"That would give us a chance to get better organized," Compton said.

## Detectives: Suspect plotted to kill police

SANDPOINT (AP) — While fighting extradition from Washington to Sandpoint, the accused killer of retired school teacher Paul Gruber tried to arrange the killings of three Bonner County deputies, authorities say.

They believe Darryl Robin Kuehl, 46, tried to contract the deaths of detectives Harvey Thompson, John Valdez and Howard Burke, Thompson said on Wednesday.

Kuehl was arrested in Gig Harbor, Wash., where he was held until his extradition. He faces seven felony counts, including the murder of Gruber.

Mr. Toad's Wild Ride

Northside Playhouse harkens to 'Wind in the Willows'

"Glorious, stirring sight!" murmured Toad ... The poetry of motion! The real way to travel! The only way to travel! Here today - in next week tomorrow! Villages skipped, towns and cities jumped - always somebody else's horizon!"

WIN-FALLS — Anybody seen Mr. Toad? Maybe he'll be taking a classic car for a joyride, or grabbing a hamburger as he hops off to the next adventure.

Mr. Toad has escaped from the Northside Playhouse rehearsals of Kenneth Grahame's "Wind in the Willows," set to open Monday night in the College of Southern Idaho's Fine Arts Building auditorium. But the eccentric amphibian will be back to delight the audience.

Still, if you're looking for gay in a warty brown-and-green outfit, you won't find him. "Mr. Toad is very bouncy, spontaneous, and over-the-top," said Brad Campbell, the man behind the toad.

Campbell said he jumps around quite a bit — he uses a pogo stick as a prop and makes up to accentuate his eyes for that bulging look. He wears clothes like any other human, although his may be more distinctive.

"I have one song where I stand still, but I'm (usually) running around a courtroom, dancing, driving a car," Campbell said. "Toad seems to think he can do ballet," he added. Campbell has never had any ballet training — or any dance training — but then again, neither has Toad.

Campbell has enjoyed acting as Mr. Toad, even in public. "It's just fun to see different people's reactions," he said. "Some think I'm insane. It's an experience, but it's fun."

Having "toad sightings" around town is the idea of PHILADELPHIA — "Hey, Macarena, if you have functioning ears and a working radio, you've heard it. If you've been to a wedding, a bar mitzvah, a picnic, or a club, you've seen it. Hey, Macarena!"

The U.S. women's gymnastic team did it at the Olympics. The Phanatic does it at Phillies games. Bicycle racers do it. Ballplayers do it. Danes from 5 to 85 do it, from the cities to the suburbs, at house parties and block parties and nightclubs and Sweet Sixteens. "Hey, Macarena!" And if the song, and the dance that it spawned, haven't already occupied that space in your brain previously, reserved for fast-food jingles, philosophies of life, and the location of your car keys, just wait. If you're planning to leave the house before the end of the summer, you will encounter the Macarena. So what is it? For starters, a song, sung and chanted in Spanish, with a percolating,

Robin Havens-McCracken, and Mike Winterholler, the director for this year's production. "We wanted to do something different that no one has done before," Winterholler explained. "Not too many people know about this show, and we want to catch the people's eye."

No one knows exactly what he'll do, either. That's part of the appeal of this 1985 musical, based on Grahame's classic children's tale, which was published in 1908. Toad is supposed to have an enthusiasm for life that is usually outrageous and brings trouble for everyone: Nathan Lane, of "Birdcage" fame, played him on Broadway.

"Wind" has also been incarnated twice in movies, once in a 1949 Disney short and again in a 1983 stop-action feature film. The story starts with Mole, played by Shanna Fuller, who leaves the underground for a life of adventure. She meets the kindly Water Rat brought to life by Rich Bevan (yes, the same Twin Falls County prosecutor who played Striking Ball last year in the Northside Playhouse's "Annie Get Your Gun.") They meet Mr. Toad and fight alongside Mr. Badger, the only boxing champion played by Matthew Frantz.

The Macarena craze continues to rule the American pop music scene, with no less than three versions of the record-setting Spanish dance song making up this week on the pop/dance top 100 charts. Leading the pack is the "Spanish Fly" version of the song, which combines English lyrics by a Miami DJ with the original Spanish lyrics written and composed by Los Del Rio (the Spanish names for Wings and Bad Company). That version jumped from No. 4 to No. 1 last week, and retained its position on top this week by scoring impressive gains in both second sales and radio plays. At the same time, Los Del Rio's original all-Spanish recording of "Macarena" edged up from No. 53 to No. 48. Also moving up was a version by the Canadian group Los Del Rio, whose version rose from No. 80 to No. 78.

Here, a couple of PG-rated hip swings there, not as salacious as the lambada, or as hard to figure out as an intricate line dance like the Achy Breaky. Glenn Kalina, program director of radio station WIOQ-FM in Philadelphia, heard the song and saw the dance on a cruise. He brought back several versions of the record, and in the fall of 1995, WIOQ became one of the first radio stations on the East Coast to give Macarena airtime. The song went nowhere. "It was on for three months, and it didn't seem to be taking off," Kalina said.

# 'Gods and Generals': More from the Civil War dynasty

In the 20 years since its publication, Michael Shaara's elegiac Civil War novel "The Killer Angels" has established a deserved reputation as a definitive work on the defining experience in our history.

Limiting himself to the four days of the pivotal Battle of Gettysburg in July 1863 and ranging among the leaders on both sides, Shaara distilled the courage, tragedy and carnage into a book of wrenching eloquence. "The Killer Angels" won the Pulitzer Prize and inspired Ronald Maxwell's overpowering movie "Gettysburg," which was released in theaters and then shown in an uncut six-hour version as a mini-

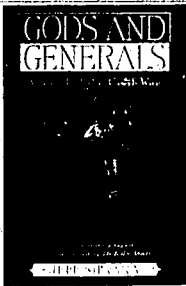

segments to each figure. Shaara's best starts in "Gods and Generals" is to nuke men who now stand as unnoticed monuments outside courthouses and humanize them.

Here we find Lee not only as the consummate strategist somehow besting superior odds but as the man who agonized over the rapid decline of his wife's health. Jackson emerges vividly as a man of daunting faith and piety whose beliefs are tested by a cruel God inflicting Job-like tests. As the book opens, Jackson has lost his mother, his wife and his daughter. A boring by-the-book teacher in the classroom at Virginia Military Institute, Jackson becomes a charismatic figure loved by men who would follow him anywhere.

Shaara's best passages freshen the familiar details of Jackson's end, which entailed a crushing irony for the South. In one of history's most celebrated friendly fire catastrophes, Jackson died in a hail of musketry from his own men during a night of chaotic confusion at Chancellorsville. Southern soldiers thus dealt their own cause a crushing blow.

Elsewhere, "Gods and Generals" has a little trouble sustaining its ambitious structure, especially in dealing with the figure of Hancock, who is often reduced to chafing at the lethargy and stupidity of Union leadership. The demands of the ground Shaara has elected to try to cover are sometimes unfavorable for creating dramatic conflicts.

There are some resonant echoes of Michael Shaara's style in "Gods and Generals," but little of the comic narrative power. If Jeffrey Shaara has not sealed the heights his father attained in "The Killer Angels," there is no shame in that. Nobody else has either.

## How to become a really successful author

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Attorney Brooke A. Wharton claims lineage to author Edith Wharton and represents writers in the entertainment field.

And she has created a hot property herself — a how-to book for all those would-be John Grishams called, "The Writer Got Screwed (But Didn't Have To)."

With chapters like "How Can I Write Nasty Things About People I Know and Not Get Sued" and "What Can I Do If I Don't Have an Agent, Attorney, or Manager?" Wharton has written a primer for the aspiring screenwriter, TV writer and even cyberscribe.

Yes, she may be the first Hollywood insider to instruct on deal-making in Sillwood (short for Silicon Hollywood) where a writer for an interactive game may think she's made a bundle by offering 18-months' worth of work for \$18,000 when the company will make \$18 million off her story-puzzle.

Jeffrey Sullivan, co-founder of Digital Arcana, which designs and produces interactive games, told Wharton agents don't know how to maneuver digital.

"Even those that are positioning themselves as interactive agents are a very, very mixed bag," Sullivan says in the book. "Some of them are excellent, but most of them range from moderately to dangerously uninformed about industry trends and practices."

Wharton said there's a phenomenon occurring because of the amount of money being thrown down for writers and first-time or spec scripts.

Wharton's publicist at Harper Collins reports "The Writer," which retails for \$22, has 8,200 copies in print. That's a respectable start for a book written for beginners and all those who aspire.

"Everybody believes they have a million-dollar, billion-dollar idea," Wharton said. "I just

got a fax from an ear-nose-throat specialist" in Wisconsin. Everyone has an idea they want to write, they think they can write. So this is geared for those people who are trying to do it. OK, you want to do it? You don't have to be an insider. God, you don't have to be a lawyer."

Grisham, a lawyer and former state lawmaker, is famous for best-selling legal thrillers that quickly make it to the big screen: "A Time to Kill," "The Firm" and "The Client."

Jacket praise for Wharton's book includes agents and writers and even another entertainment attorney who called it "a hot property" and reader-friendly guide to understanding legalese surrounding the industry.

Anita Zuckerman, producer of the novel-turned-movie about a Savannah, Ga., murder "Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil" said: "Here you'll find all the tricks Hollywood's dealmeisters don't want you to know."

Wharton won't identify her clients, starting an ethical promise, but she has interviews in her book with screenwriter Jane Anderson ("How to Make an American Quilt"), producers Gary Goldstein ("Pretty Woman," "Under Siege") and Steve Kronish (television's "The Commish" and "Wiseguy"). Lawrence Meyers, executive story editor of the popular TV

show "Picket Fences," and Phillip Lazebnik, screenwriter on Disney's animated "Pocahontas."

"Writers are getting really

much more powerful these days because of the need for good content and a good story is becoming much more intense," Wharton said.

## Book review

As a teenager, Jeffrey Shaara accompanied his father on his first excursion to Gettysburg battlefield — a trip that moved the elder Shaara to begin the massive research required for "The Killer Angels." With "Gods and Generals" (Ballantine Books, \$25), Jeffrey Shaara cannot be said to be following in his father's footsteps, since he has written a long prelude. The action of "Gods and Generals" unfolds in the five years before Gettysburg and the clash of arms that would seal the fate of the South.

It would be nice to report like father-like son, but it would also be too much to expect that the Shaaras can could produce another classic of Civil War fiction. "Gods and Generals" is an honorable, readable sprawl of a book that seeks to adapt the narrative techniques of "The Killer Angels" to a much less hospitable purpose and framework.

The compression of "The Killer Angels" gives way to diffusion as "Gods and Generals" encompasses the lives of four protagonists who would face one another at Gettysburg. Shaara has wisely chosen Stumessell Jackson and Robert E. Lee from the Confederate side and Joshua Chamberlain and Winfield Scott Hancock to represent the Union. In a sometimes unwieldy arrangement, "Gods and Generals" moves back and forth across the battle lines, devoting

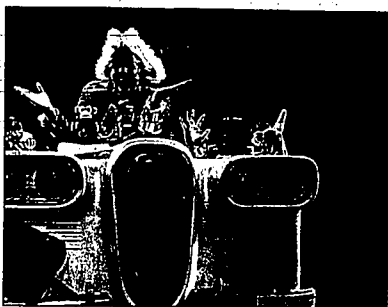

## Guess Who's coming to play in Twin Falls?

TWIN FALLS — The Guess Who, a Canadian blues band that gave the world singer Burton Cummings and guitarist Randy Bachman, plans an outdoor concert here in September.

The group will play in Bruin Stadium on Sept. 14 as a benefit for Valley House, a Twin Falls homeless shelter. Two local groups, the Eddie Haskell Band and Twister, will open the show at 6 p.m.

The Guess Who had a remarkable run on the pop charts for an 11-month stretch of 1969 and 1970. "These Eyes," "Laughin'," "No Time" and "American Woman" all cracked the Billboard Top 10, with "American Woman" spending three weeks at No. 1 in the spring of 1970.

But like many rock groups of its era, The Guess Who is probably most famous for its breakup. Bachman, who had co-founded the band in Winnipeg,

Manitoba, seven years earlier, converted to Mormonism and left The Guess Who in the summer of 1970, later to form Bachman-Turner Overdrive with two of his brothers and bassist Fred Turner.

Although The Guess Who had a couple of Top 10 hits after Bachman's departure ("Share the Land" and "Clap for the Wolfman"), it never achieved the same status.

Cummings went on to a successful solo career ("Stand Tall," "You Saved My Soul") after The Guess Who disbanded in 1975.

But The Guess Who continued to play reunion concerts, and fueled by the rise of classic rock radio, has been touring in recent years, playing nearly 200 shows annually.

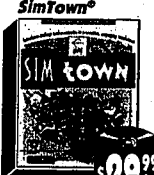

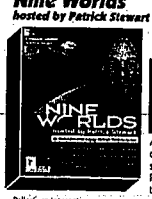

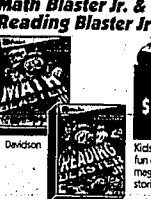

# 'Dusk,' 'White Squall' top shelves of local video stores

New videos in Twin Falls stores this week:

□ "From Dusk 'Til Dawn" (R) — As both a veteran-video-store clerk and movie junkie, Quentin Tarantino knows that "Desperate Hours" belongs in the drama section and "Night of the Living Dead" in the horror. So when, if he had his old job, would he rack Robert Rodriguez's "From Dusk 'Til Dawn," which, in the blink of an eye, shifts from the first genre to the second, all in the name of comedy?

Tarantino wrote "From Dusk 'Til Dawn" in 1990 for a reported fee of \$1,500. It was undoubtedly one of those projects he hoped to get made for the price of a used Acme, and maybe garner a few kind words in Fangoria magazine. But something called "Pulp Fiction" happened, and a script that would — should — still be collecting dust has become a major motion picture.

"From Dusk 'Til Dawn" is a film-nerd's fever dream, a Frankenstein's monster of used movie parts, deliberately mismatched styles and delightfully implausible characters. For a full hour, it is the story of a pair of murdering, bank-robbing brothers holding a family hostage while making their escape into Mexico. Then, after they arrive at a topless biker bar in the middle of nowhere, it becomes a chaotic, bloody, non-stop battle with ancient Aztec vampires. Something like that.

For "Pulp Fiction" fans, that first hour has its moments. Its comic violence and deadpan dialogue are pure-Bent Tarantino, and the brothers Gecko — played by the commanding George Clooney, from "Tomb Raider," and uncharacteristically restrained Tarantino — are riotously evil. Clooney's Seth is the rational one, the tough-talking boss with just the faintest hint of a conscience, and Tarantino's Jules is a paranoid schizophrenic, detecting a conspiracy or a com-

on with every twitch of a hostage. The brothers have left a trail of bodies from Missouri to Texas when they decide to murder the motorhome of the vacationing Fuller family — the ex-parson Jacob (Harvey Keitel), with a scruffy beard and a sometime twang), his daughter Kate (Juliette Lewis; the desert wouldn't be the same without her), and son Scott (Ernest Liu). With his children's lives on the line, Jacob agrees to drive the Geckos across the border, and to the nightclub where they are to rendezvous with the rest of their gang.

This club looks like a Hell's Angels Fourth of July celebration in the Twilight Zone. There are leather-clad bikers sitting at every table, and beautiful, naked women dancing all around them. No sooner have the brothers and their hostages settled in at their table than a lizard-faced vampire and the bar fight of the century is on. (The Washington Post) (Hastings, Blockbuster, Video West)

□ "White Squall" (PG-13) — It is intimated near the end of Ridley Scott's "White Squall" that the title storm condition may be a myth, and if we weren't told otherwise, we might regard the entire adventure in the same light. Not because the events are so improbable, but because they were so churned up in the imaginations of Scott and writer Todd Robinson that little about them rings true.

The essential story, of course, is true. In 1960, 13 preppies set sail with Ocean Academy captain-schoolmaster — Christopher Shelton aboard a twin-masted brigantine named the Albatross on a voyage from the Caribbean to the South Pacific and back, an eight-month trip highlighted by an encounter with a Cuban gannet on the eye of the Bay of Pigs invasion and ended by a storm that sank the vessel, leaving

four boys, one crew member and Sheldon's wife.

During the subsequent Coast Guard hearing, to determine the fate of Sheldon's U.S. master seaman's certificate, the captain heard himself described as both a modern-day Bligh and a liberal guardian who gave the boys too much freedom on shore and too little instruction aboard. The surviving students, taking seriously the Ocean Academy's Musketeer adage, "We go one, we go all," had another opinion entirely.

That the real Christopher Sheldon served as an adviser on "White Squall" provides a clue to the view the film holds of him, and Jeff Bridges' comment that he took his inspiration from Mike Nelson, the character his father played on the TV series "Sea Hunt," provides another. Whatever the truth of Sheldon's behavior aboard the Albatross, it's hidden beneath the dramatic veneer of a story that has more in common with "Deadly Years Society" than "The Wreck of the Hesperus." (Newsday) (Video West, Hastings, Blockbuster)

□ "Restoration" (R) — Robert Downey Jr., who lately has had trouble finding his own house, leads us safely through the 17th century in this engaging Michael Hoffman historical saga. Downey is a randy physician named Robert Merivel, an endearing scoundrel who undergoes a moral journey from the opulent court of Charles II to the plague-infested streets of London.

Meshinks the movie, adapted from Rose Tremenay's novel of the same name, gets a trifle wearisome — particularly when Merivel's spiritual redemption leads him into the arms of ul, Meg Ryan. As a haunted asylum inmate who changes Merivel's life, she stands out like a sore, 20th-century thumb. But a comically piquant script by Rupert Walters, and Michael "Soapdish" Hoffman's bright, witty direction lead us past this wanky episode.

Merivel, a medical student with a gift for healing and a thirst for knowledge, lives during the

## New 'Aladdin' arrives Tuesday

So will Aladdin and Jasmine get married or what? Inquiring fans of Disney's 1992 blockbuster "Aladdin" want to know.

And they'll find out when "Aladdin and the King of Thieves," the final installment of the "Aladdin" trilogy, is released on Tuesday. ("The Return of Jafar," the first sequel to "Aladdin," was released in 1994.) Robin Williams returns as the voice of Aladdin's best buddy, Genie, which he originated in "Aladdin." (Dan Castellana, voice of Homer Simpson, was the voice in "Jafar.")

But if you want to munch on popcorn while you watch, you'll have to pop it yourself. Like "Jafar," you won't find Restoration, when science, the arts and almost every diversion were accorded the King's dilettantish indulgence. But as Merivel discovers, he also lives in the time of bubonic plague, a pestilence that mutes the death-mates London's population before the Great Fire of London purges it from the city once and for all.

Merivel gets quite a career boost when he is summoned to view a patient whose heart — following a gruesome accident — is completely exposed. Merivel's best friend and fellow student John Pearce (David Thewlis) can't bring himself to touch the beating organ. But Merivel, driven by fascination, touches it. His action is witnessed by none other than the King (Sam Neill), who promptly requests Downey's services. If Merivel saves his ailing dog, Charles declares, he will be made royal physician.

Through tender care, rather than anything particularly medical, Merivel restores the dog to health and is invited to the court. Establishing himself as a doltish

"King of Thieves" at your local multiplex. Look instead to the small screen and on the shelves of video stores.

Once the province of awful B-grade (or worse) slasher-flicks, the direct-to-video market is undergoing a renaissance.

Disney wants to turn conventional wisdom about movies released straight to video on its head. And Disney hopes to appeal to the 90 million VCR owners who get their entertainment predominantly on video. Family-oriented movies, in particular, says Moloney, are suited to the video market. "This particular type of movie is very repeatable in viewing. Kids like to see movies several times, which makes it a perfect choice for purchase."

Moloney also notes that sequels work well on video because viewers are already familiar with the characters. That calls for less marketing and promotion.

## Texas troubadour Don Walser makes Western swing mainstream

HOUSTON (AP) — Don Walser's success story turns the sappy waitress-discovered-by-Hollywood tale on its ear.

For decades, the beefy troubadour behind the falsetto yodel kept one hand strumming twangy cowboy tunes in relative obscurity while working as a National Guard mechanic in his native West Texas.

Then a state job had him relocate to Austin a few years ago and there, as he played what Walser calls "Top 40 Country from 40 years ago," he caught the ear of none other than Jeff Pinkus, the then-bass player for alternative rock's notorious Bumhole Surfers.

"He got the whole thing started," laughs Walser, recalling after a recent Houston performance his ironic discovery by the alternative music crowd.

"We're too country for country," the 61-year-old Walser jokes, marveling how he and his Pure Texas Band have made vintage country and western swing music the hip new sound craved by nose-ringed youths and goat-ted twenties-somethings.

"Alternative folks were looking for an alternative," says Pinkus, who lives in San Marcos. "Everybody seemed to have grown up with it."

Pinkus dragged his producer, Led Zeppelin's John Paul Jones, to hear what Austin's pierced

and leather jacket crowd was flocking to old-time country music that existed way before line dancing, Garth Brooks and The Nashville Network.

"You know what I think it is, is the young people right now today are looking for anything that's good. I mean they really are. They're searching for values. They're searching for something old and the old country music was made by country people, good people," said Walser, the man now dubbed the "Prezzeroni of the Plains."

Pinkus persuaded Walser to move out of a now-defunct Austin redneck hangout to Emo's, where young punk could get a better reception and hear the music many of them vaguely recall from their parents' era.

"Our music is such that it's kind of new to the young people because they haven't heard it before," Walser says. "And then the old people haven't heard it in 30 or 40 years. We see people bring or their grandparents, or their mothers and dads."

"I think for musicians to see a guy who can sing like that, it's something," Pinkus says. "It's sheer talent."

Armed with the success of

"Rolling Stone From Texas," his 1994 debut album, Walser is promoting his newest release, "Texas Top Head" bringing the "W" back to C.W.

His live plays like an old country ballad. Raised in Lamesa by his widowed father, the ninth-grade dropout played top 40

music at first, then turned to the successful sound of traditional songs heeded to the family radio via the Grand Ole Opry, the Hay Ride show from Shreveport, La., and other stations along the Texas-Mexico border.

"The songs were pure. I don't mean they were necessarily religious or anything, but they came from the heart," Walser explains. "They weren't a production item. Most of the things that are done today have got a lot of buzz and

Occasionally, Walser shared bills with that "skinny kid with glasses," Lubbock's Buddy Holly. Unlike Holly, who took country music forward by mixing it with R&B, blues, gospel and pop to develop his own sound, Walser stuck with the music that appears to now make Nashville

win.

"Used to, you could turn on the radio and maybe you didn't like Ernest Tubb, but you would like Marty Robbins," he says. "Maybe you didn't like Marty Robbins, but you would surely like Merle Haggard or George Jones. And all the guys sounded different."

Walser made his own Nashville pilgrimage in the mid-1960s. The mix of traditional country music, western swing and honky-tonk blues was well-received, but he was quickly and kindly told his sound was too dated.

"There's more real country music, with the exception of the Opry, out here in the nether, nether lands than there is in Nashville," he says.

Walser continued to write his own songs while playing venerable country favorites and inserting in them an irrepressible Walser yodel.

"I started doing that whenever I was just a young kid. Dad had a bunch of old Jimmie Rodgers

records around and I learned to yodel. His yodel was fairly easy to learn," Walser said. "Most of the people had a little yodel in some of their songs."

Despite Walser's pokey path to cult-favorite status, his timing couldn't be better.

In Texas and across the nation, more non-commercial radio stations are switching to or featuring the "Americana" format. A catchall for hard-to-peg artists such as Walser, Lyle Lovett,

Robert Earl Keen, Junior Brown, Alejandro Escovedo or Fish Hinojosa, Americana is noted in a folk and country-based sound that crosses gender, race and age.

"Some of those people that are performing are just doing their thing from the heart and it's Texas music, because they live here I guess. But it's not what you call dyed-in-the-wool country music of any kind," Walser says. "But that don't matter, they're playing music from the heart."

## Political humor gets downright dirty and low

Jay Leno hit below the belt to get his "first really big laugh" at Bob Dole's expense.

"On MTV, they asked Dole if he wore boxers or briefs," Leno told "Tonight Show" viewers during the presidential primary campaign, one-two. "And he said, 'Depends.'"

As for President Clinton, it's no wonder he "likes the Olympic torch so much," Leno recently joked. "It's the first time he's been around an old flame that he hasn't had to deny anything."

Whether you're grinning, groaning or grimacing depends on more than your candidate of choice. Sensibilities, generation gaps and any lingering "respect for the presidency" also can make or break America's funny bones. Are today's comedians

less filling, more infamously or are they merely in sync with cynical times that demand a crass course in political humor? Can an avalanche of barbed one-liners affect an election or trivialize it in the point of absurdity? Go ahead, laugh.

Two generations ago, as a boy in South Dakota, NBC anchor Tom Brokaw recalls watching his father tip his hat to President Franklin D. Roosevelt when he visited the state. FDR was a liberal Democrat, and Brokaw's father a conservative Republican.

"I'm not doing it for Roosevelt. I'm doing it for the office," he recalls his dad telling him.

"You'd never see anybody doing that anymore," Brokaw says now. "I don't mean to raise politicians to sainthood level. But we're kind of all in this together. If we just constantly demean people who come into public ser-

vice in the most base possible way, I don't think that's such a great idea."

Bob Hope's gently jabbing monologues of the elder Brokaw's time have given way to "Saturday Night Live's" thumb-in-the-eye satire. The comparatively cerebral humor of a now-annual Moral Sahl collides with the gut-level "Animal House" instincts of Leno and fellow late-nighters David Letterman ("Bill Tubby, our president") and Conan O'Brien ("Easier today Bob Dole ended his 35-year career in Congress. Tomorrow he'll be taken out to the country where they'll use him to make glue").

Dean Cain's since-canceled ABC comedy series depicted a mock Pat Buchanan chomping on a "spicy Mexican heart" to underscore his get-tough immigration policy. Mix in the Comedy Central cable channel's

ongoing campaign coverage, spearheaded by nightly doses of "Politically Incorrect." And on HBO, Dennis Miller rants about the "ruddy-faced frat rat" running the country.

"When I was a kid, topical political humor was Bob Hope making a joke about Eisenhower's golf game," says ABC political analyst Jeff Greenfield.

As a grown-up, he wonders whether "this endless spate of jokes on mainstream television — that Dole is senile and Clinton is a far, scuzzed whatever" — is yielding a "whole bundle of ironic if not sarcastic coverage" of presidential politics.

"It's a valid question, but you just can't sit down and dwell on that," irreverent New York radio personality Don Imus says. "Otherwise you end up doing nothing."

# Ex-Manic injects songs with social awareness, seriousness

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Natalie Merchant makes no apologies for injecting her concerts with a little social consciousness.

During a stop here this summer, the pop singer let the audience know that on their way out they could donate money or items at a table set up to benefit a local battered women's shelter. "I always make the assumption that if people like my records there's a certain level of sensitivity and tolerance for some serious subject matter seeping into the music," she said.

In a hotel room the day after the concert, Merchant exudes a sense of simplicity in a blue-and-white striped dress, face free of makeup (she never wears it), wavy brown hair tied up in a loose knot draped below the neck.

Merchant is part of a well-known cadre of singers, including friends Michael Stipe and Peter Gabriel, who are socially and politically active. In fact, the three recently appeared on "VH1 Honors," a program that benefited the Witness program, which provides groups around the world with hand-held video cameras to document human rights violations.

"I just think it's my responsibility as a citizen," she said of her activism. "I don't like to point fingers at other artists, because a lot of artists all they're devoted to is making people feel good. That's an admirable aim in life to make people feel good."

Among Merchant's top causes are animal rights, domestic violence and homelessness. And no hamburgers for the singer, please, she's a vegetarian.

In fact, Merchant, 32, turned to her activism after her breakup with 10,000 Maniacs, a band she had fronted since she was 17 and with which she had recorded such classics as "Trouble Me," "Because the Night" and "Like the Weather."

"The decision to leave came shortly before she turned 30, an age in which 'you want to assess your life and decide am I achieving what I would like to at this point in my life? I didn't think I was...'

"The final months of touring with the band felt more like a contractual obligation than enjoyment of her work. 'I was feeling very cynical about music. I was just feeling like it was all about commerce at that point,' she recalled.

To rejuvenate and refocus, Merchant took six months off, lived in Manhattan and spent two to three days a week volunteering at a homeless shelter on the edge of Harlem.

"There were plenty of times I had to remove dead rats or knives or crack from the playground. It was just New York. It wasn't a pleasant place for children," she said. "But when you played music for them, this calm and peace would come over the

room."

The experience, she's quick to point out, was not one-sided. "It's not all this bleeding-heart altruism; I gave out of it too. For me working with the kids gave me a sense of belonging and a sense of worth," she recalled.

That in turn inspired the singer-songwriter to sit back down at her piano and churn out her first solo album, "Tigerlily." Released last year, it has produced three hits: "Carnival," "Jealousy" and "Wonder." Another single, "San Andreas Fault," will be released at the end of August, she said.

One song on the album is a tribute to another activist friend, actor River Phoenix, who died of a drug overdose outside a Sunset

# 3DO a winner in all but popularity contest

Too bad no one considers the 3DO much of a player these days. Although never very popular with the consumer, the old maid of 32-bit rigs is still hosting games that blow away its younger competitors.

"I've said it before, but it can't be emphasized enough if you're looking for some great games... and lots of them... the 3DO might be the system for you. The risk is whether the machine will be around much longer and whether third-party developers will continue to write very many games for it."

For instance, two of the three games I played on a recent weekend were out of 3DO's in-house development unit, Studio 3DO, and the other was published by GoldStar, one of the rig's two licensed manufacturers. Even so, all three were fantastic and varied enough to keep my attention even when the sunshine and waves beckoned.

Captain Quazar got the day off to a great start with a well-armed stroll through the territory of the Forces of Evil. This cartoonish shooter is perhaps the best I've played in a long time.

## Games people play

Think Loaded with a sense of humor and without all the gore and you've got a pretty good idea what Captain Quazar is like.

I like games with a sense of humor, and Quazar has it in abundance. Consider that the game begins with an announcer counting down from five. Once he finishes, a message flashes to tell players that after they do that five more times the game will start.

Most disc-based games hide their load times or try to dress them up. But Quazar makes fun of them. Nice touch, and Quazar himself is a caricature of all heroes with big teeth and grossly exaggerated musculature. Even his overbearing boss is a hoot.

But none of that detracts from superior game play. The shooting action is fast and furious, with a third-person, three-quarter view.

Quazar has full mobility within environments and can blow away walls and doors and even entire buildings with a giant arsenal of weapons.

The enemies seem never to

end, and blasting them does not produce the usual graphic display of splashing innards. Instead bad guys just fall over and hang so tamboresque. Why revel in violent deaths? Captain

Quazar focuses on the lighter side of intergalactic warfare.

As hard as it was to tear myself away from Captain Quazar, I finally quit and popped in Battlesport, a cross between electronic football and a first-person tank shooter.

Players pilot well-armed hovering crafts in futuristic arenas as they hunt for the ever elusive ball. Once found, players try to carry the ball to the goal and shoot for points. Sounds easy, but it isn't — particularly when your opponent is blasting your ship, trying to make you fumble.

This was an unexpected surprise. Battlesport is addictive, and although I played against the computer, I imagine two-player action gets pretty hairy. The only element of Battlesport

that needs improvement is the control. Getting ships to respond fast enough takes considerable practice.

But with almost no practice, I mastered BC Racers, a GoldStar title that first appeared on the PC. BC Racers is a simple and friendly little game of prehistoric unimpressive racing.

I head it on the PC, but found it even better on 3DO. Everything seems a little sharper, a little faster. The joyride, as always, gave me some problems, but that's just what happens when you try to race with a directional pad.

So 3DO may be having a tough time in these hyper-competitive days, but I would sure hate to see it disappear. Good games are hard to come by, and it seems that 3DO designers know their system better than most. Let's hope they can hang on at least until the long-promised 64-bit upgrade shows up.

Then things will really get interesting.

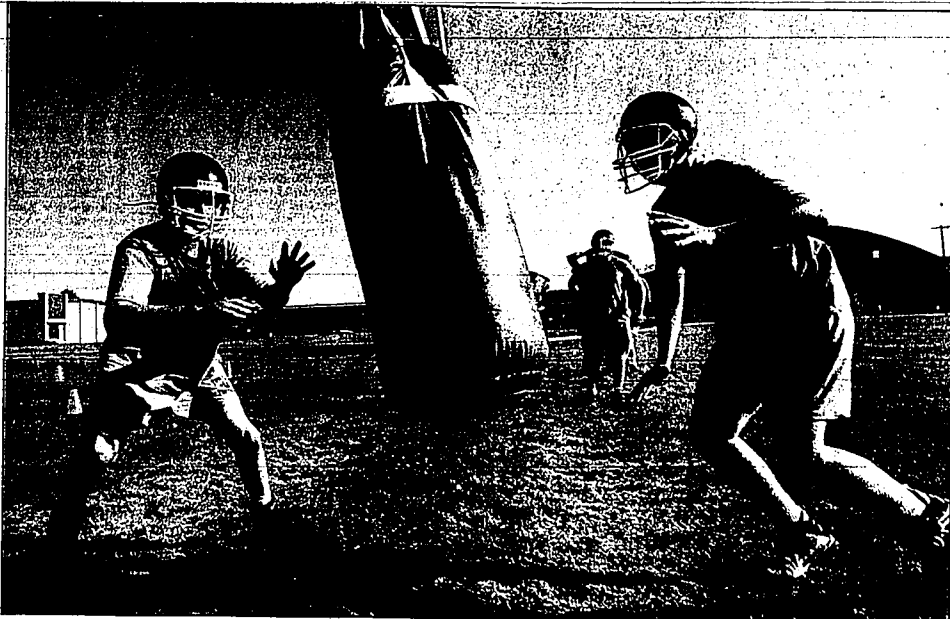

## Doctors operate on BSU's Allen

Boise State University football coach Pokey Allen underwent surgery Thursday to rid his body of a tenacious cancer that has spread to his chest.

Allen, the 52-year-old coach credited with reviving a flagging program, has rhabdomyosarcoma, a rare muscle cancer that affects around 1,000 people a year in the United States.

"He's out of surgery and stable," said Marsha Skinner, administrative supervisor at the University of Washington Medical Center. "He hasn't even talked to his surgeons. He would like to talk to them first."

Surgery, along with months of chemotherapy that nearly killed Allen, destroyed the grapefruit-sized tumor in his right arm muscle. But before the tumor's defeat, it sent out cancer cells that he lodged in his chest.

Allen is battling cancer in one of its deadliest forms.

"These are highly malignant tumors that generally aren't cured," said Hugh Shingleton, a 30-year cancer specialist on the staff of the American Cancer Society.

He was diagnosed with the cancer in his arm in December 1994. The tumor was removed in March 1995. And after eight months of exhaustive chemotherapy and a stem-cell transplant procedure, Allen's cancer was declared in remission last December.

But his doctors said then that the rhabdomyosarcoma could always return and that Allen had only a 35-percent chance of surviving the cancer.

## Seahawks' owner touts fan response

SPOKANE, Wash. - Nearly everyone responding to a statewide mailing from billionaire Paul Allen wants the Seattle Seahawks to remain in Seattle, the man leading Allen's effort to buy the football team said Thursday.

Bob Whitsitt, president of the Microsoft co-founder's possible purchase of the team from Ken Behring, who wants to move the Seahawks to the Los Angeles area.

In July, Allen sent a letter to about 50,000 season ticket-holders, elected officials and community leaders, asking for supporter support for a better football stadium.

Allen, who also owns the Portland Trail Blazers of the NBA, told the Spokane Rotary Club that 6,000 people had sent back responses to the letters.

## ChiSox head opposes labor deal

CHICAGO - While management negotiator Randy Levine tried Thursday to convince owners to support a proposed labor deal, White Sox Chairman Jerry Reinsdorf said an agreement is far from approval.

"I don't believe most teams are in favor," Reinsdorf said.

Eight of the 28 teams can block any agreement by voting against it. Asked if he thought supporters of the agreement could get the necessary 21 votes for passage, Reinsdorf replied: "I don't think they can get 15 votes."

Reinsdorf said he was opposed to the proposed deal but denied an Associated Press report that said he was leading the fight against it and was trying to

convince other teams to vote against it as well. "That is not true. What was presented to me, I was against. But I have not called one single team. In fact, a lot of guys were calling me to make sure I'm not going to vote for it. I'm not a leader. I've given (my thoughts on) it in the (owners' labor) committee."

Citing unnamed sources, the AP reported seven teams are against the agreement because of their opposition

to giving the union service time from the 75 regular-season games wiped out from the strike in 1994 and '95. Those teams were the Sox, Cubs, Atlanta, Florida, Kansas City, Minnesota and Montreal.

Reinsdorf declined to say whether or not he was opposed to crediting players with service time. His general manager, Ron Schueler, publicly has stated his opposition to granting it, as has Cubs President Andy MacPhail.

Reinsdorf has been portrayed as the most influential of the hard-line owners during the strike, partly because of his relationship with Milwaukee owner and acting commissioner Bud Selig.

It's an image Reinsdorf has denied adamantly over the years, and one he denied again on Thursday.

At first, police said Mees jumped into the pool to save his 4-year-old daughter Gabrielle, but authorities later said that account could not be confirmed. The only people present during the accident were Mees and his two daughters, Gabrielle and 8-year-old Lauren.

Police said Thursday that their investigation of the case is closed.

Mees was one of ESPN's original sports anchors, starting with the network in 1979. In recent years, he also was an announcer on NHL, college football and college basketball games.

Nolan Ryan's number to be retired — again

HOUSTON — Nolan Ryan holds or shares more than 50 major league, American League and National League records. Add one more.

The Houston Astros announced Thursday they will retire Ryan's No. 34, making him the first player in major league history to have his number retired by three teams.

Next month, both the Astros and the Texas Rangers will honor Ryan, who had more strikeouts, more no-hitters and more overall records than anyone else in baseball history.

Accident claims college basketball player

FAIRMONT, W.Va. — A Fairmont State basketball player died when a car in which he was a passenger hit a telephone pole, flipped and skidded across the road, authorities say.

The accident that killed Gyrain Bailey, 21, a redshirt freshman guard from York, Pa., occurred early Wednesday in York. Bailey was pronounced dead at York Hospital, said York County Coroner Kathryn Fourham. "It's a real shock to all of us," Fairmont State coach Russ Henwell said. "To have one of our players die in an auto accident is awful."

Young American diver wins national title

MOULTREE, Ga. — Troy Dumais, the 16-year-old diver being touted by many as the next Greg Louganis, beat defending champion Dean Panaro on the 1-meter springboard Thursday for his first national title on Thursday in the National Diving Championships.

Dumais beat Panaro by 15 points and is believed to be the youngest male diver to win a national crown. Louganis, who won a record 47 national titles, won his first title in 1978.

Dumais narrowly missed making the 1996 U.S. Olympic Team on a platform with a third-place finish in the Olympic Trials. Louganis won a silver medal on platform in the 1976 Olympics.

They joined Smith's wife, Monica, and their two children, Sydney and Nolan, and about 1,000 friends and family members at the Saint Stephen Baptist Church to honor Smith, who played nine seasons in the NBA with five different teams.

Smith, 34, was on a seven-day cruise with his family and members of the Bulls organization last week when he died of apparent respiratory failure brought on by motion-sickness medicines.

Ex-NFL star Martin sentenced in drug case

DALLAS — Former Dallas Cowboys defensive star Harvey Martin is sentenced to a contest Thursday to felony cocaine possession in exchange for probation, a fine and participation in a drug treatment program.

This season has been an off year by Quale's standards: his efforts have netted only two second-place finishes and five third-place finishes.

His No. 32 Grand American Modified Chevrolet is powered and tuned by Dean. He gets help from his wife, Dana, and Bret Schwarz as well.

"We could sure use some more good help," he said.

In addition to the racing, the Quales stay busy with their 3-year-old daughter Jenna.

"My wife and I like to water ski, but we don't get to do a lot of it as it takes second place to the racing," Quale said. He and

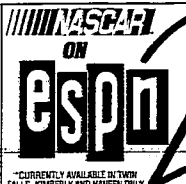
his wife also work in the family's electronics business.

401(k) plans aren't necessarily safe, secure

WASHINGTON — Edith Thomson found out the hard way that a 401(k) plan isn't necessarily a safe nest egg for retirement.

"That was my biggest mistake," said Mrs. Thomson, now 68.

Because when Carter Hawley Soutch bankruptcy protection in 1991, all \$8,000 of Mrs. Thomson's nest egg disappeared.

Popular retirement plan can be investment risk

cases in real estate, financial advisers and government officials warn. And it's becoming a growing concern as more Americans depend on the accounts.

About 23 percent of the money invested in 401(k) plans nationwide, or roughly \$520 billion, is invested in the employer's own stock, according to Access Research Inc., a Windsor, Conn., consulting firm.

"Employees should be careful what they do with their money," said Sean Hanna, of the New York-based Institute on Management & Administration.

More than 22 million Americans have money in 401(k) plans, which allow people to build retirement savings, tax-deferred, through paycheck deductions.

While many workers consider 401(k) plans the equivalent of a pension, they're very different from "defined benefit" pensions, the traditional plans offered by large firms that provide a monthly check.

Besides insurance, defined benefit plans are covered by strict rules that prevent companies from putting more than 10 percent of their stock in the plan. So such 401(k) protection exists.

Workers at the home-decorating business, Color Tile Inc., found that out the hard way. The company's investment of 401(k) money into its shares — perfectly legal — turned sour when it filed for bankruptcy this year.

With 55 percent of its assets in Wal-Mart stock and Cooper Tire & Rubber Co. with 77 percent, KOWA says.

A bill sponsored by Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif., would extend the 10 percent restriction to 401(k) plans. Boxer calls the lack of such rules "an unexcused consequence of a quirk of history."

When Congress passed the ERISA reform law in 1974, Congress didn't mean to put the burden on the employee.

"We don't want to create or exacerbate any confusion about the law," said Boxer, whose company's pension plan "is one of the same companies that are responsible for the same quirk of history in 401(k) plans."

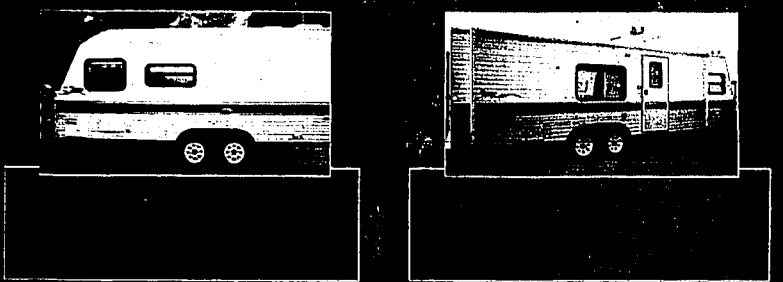

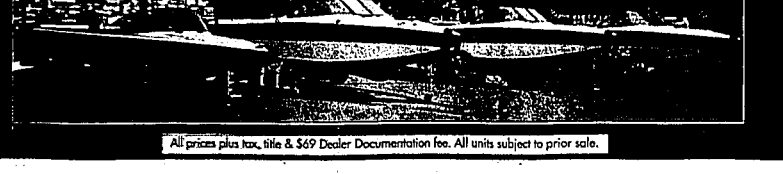

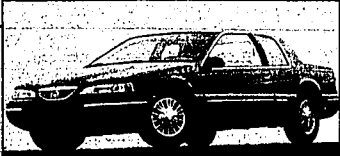

# 'Melrose Place' keeps Amanda in a spotty FOX fall schedule

## TV Data

Fox Broadcasting Company has some good news as the network begins rolling out its fall season this week.

Despite published reports to the contrary, Heather Locklear has signed for two more seasons on the network's much-criticized "Melrose Place."

Locklear's TV superstar wattage is generally regarded as the primary engine driving the nighttime soap, which was roundly slammed in a press backlash last year that rivaled the criticisms of NBC's mega-hit "Friends."

Fox president John Matoian points out that while critics may have slammed the show for its literally incredible story lines, ratings stayed strong in key demographics.

Nevertheless, Locklear says "Melrose" fans can count on Amanda reverting to her witchy ways this year, after softening up a little by the end of last season.

"I think (the writers) will make her a little tougher again, but every time she gets too tough, I go, 'Why is she always angry?'" Locklear laughs. "And then she gets too soft (and) I go, 'Why is she a baby?' She'll be a little tougher."

The actress adds that story lines will be more relationship-oriented next season instead of taking credibility-stretching detours.

"I don't think I was in those story lines - no, I'm teasing," she deadpans of her character, who has been placed in jeopardies worthy of "The Perils of Pauline." "Actually they are trying to concentrate more on relationships and

not go off into sanitari-ums so much.

"That's sometimes what makes 'Melrose Place' fun, but they've reinited it in more.

Getting "Melrose Place" back on track is only one priority at the struggling network, which is making a number of risky moves, including a roster of anything-but-surefire new shows premiering later in the season.

Among its riskiest strategy, the network is moving one of its bona fide hits, "The X-Files," to a Sunday night slot, which necessitates programming a "collapsible" show of some description in between the NFL games, which frequently run over their allotted time, and "X-Files" (the paranormal drama is among the most taped shows on TV, and Matoian has vowed to do everything he can to ensure that it begins

promptly on the hour).

"X-Files" creator Chris Carter gets his previous Friday time slot for his dark new series, "Millennium," which is brilliantly conceived and well acted (by Lance Henriksen and Megan Gallagher) but is bleak enough to make "X-Files" look like "Babe."

The consensus of TV critics at a recent fall press tour in Pasadena: Viewers will reject "Millennium" as surely as they shunned other brilliant "dark" shows such as "American Gothic" and "Profit."

To accommodate "The X-Files" on Sunday, Fox's geriatric "Married... With Children" moves to Saturday, coupled with an unexpected ally - a new-30 called, none too coincidentally, "Love and Marriage," a tag line from the "Married..." theme song.

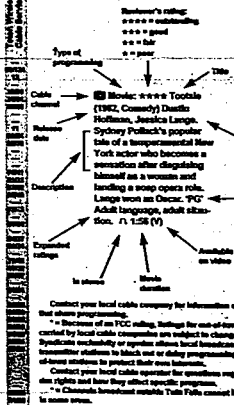

**Q:** I'd like to know something about the actress who plays nurse Haleh Adams on "ER." My mother swears she's seen her on Broadway. —**CM**

**A:** Yvette Freeman, 45, comes to television by way of a long and varied career in musicals, which began in 1979, when she debuted in Broadway's "Ain't Misbehavin'."

Freeman explains she got tired of life in the theater and the traveling it entailed, so she settled into TV work in Los Angeles. From the look of things, can look forward to a long run on one of television's hottest shows.

She's spending the summer hiatus starring as her childhood idol, legendary singer Dinah Washington, in a West Hollywood production of "Dinah Was," in which she gets to sing the blues every night.

**Q:** What's become of Lionel Richie? —**BL**

**A:** There's much hope for Richie fans. Sure, he's been off the pop charts for the last decade. When he decided to take a year off in 1986, he was at the top of his form — he'd won five Grammy awards, an Oscar, 13 American Music awards and a Golden Globe award. His albums topped the charts. He performed at the Olympics with some 2.4 billion viewers looking on.

But then the problems began. His father died. His best friend died of AIDS. Medical problems, polyps in his throat, were discovered. He and his wife got divorced. He developed songwriter's block.

The good news now is that Lionel, 47, has come to grips with all this and is back. His single "Don't Wanna Lose You" is moving up the charts. His new album, "Louder Than Words," is doing well.

And he's launched a promising side career as a movie actor, playing a club owner in director Penny Marshall's new flick, "The Preacher's Wife," with Whitney Houston and Denzel Washington.

**Q:** Hollywood celebrities are generous in their support of the motion picture home in Los Angeles. Which stars are the biggest donors? —**JW**

**A:** Among those who have been supportive of the Motion Picture & Television Fund over the years are Bob Hope, who recently donated yet another million dollars; "Melrose Place" producer Aaron Spelling, who makes a generous annual donation; and Kirk Douglas whose \$2 million built "Harry's Haven Alzheimer's Building," named in memory of his father.

In addition, George Burns' generosity established the George Burns Premiere Society, whose membership is based on industry people whose

donations are said to be extremely large. The late Rock Hudson donated generously to the fund, beginning nearly 50 years ago.

The fund exists to meet the medical and financial needs of all members of the entertainment community, from stars to cast members.

**Q:** When will we get the inspiring story about Christopher Reeve's valiant attempt to recover from his tragic horse accident? —**EJL**

**A:** The full story is coming from Reeve himself. He fully believes that his devastating spinal cord injury is a "temporary setback." Word is that he's working on an autobiography with writer Roger Rosenblatt. Random House will publish it.

There's one hitch, however: Reeve, 43, says he doesn't wish to publish the book until January 1998. Why? He explains that medical research on spinal cord regeneration is progressing rapidly: "There is more happening in the past five years than in the previous 50." Reeve hopes to conclude his autobiography with a chapter detailing his recovery.

**Q:** Princess Di has said her ambition is to be an ambassador for Great

Britain. Are the Brits generally in favor of such an idea? —**PJ**

**A:** In a recent survey in the House of Parliament, a majority of the Members — 74 percent of the Tories and 53 percent of the Labor Party — said that Di, 35, wasn't fit to hold an ambassadorial role.

**Q:** Can it really be true that Eleanor Mondale is having a romance with President Clinton? —**BJ**

**A:** Don't put that question to Eleanor, the host of cable channel E! Entertainment's "Uncut" show and the daughter of former Vice President Walter Mondale. She's likely to respond with an expletive. Sure, she's been photographed jogging with the president in California. The shots inspired news coverage implying that her friendship with Clinton is something more. The former Chicago radio host, formerly married to Chicago Bears offensive lineman Keith Van Horn, calls the rumors "totally false" and "completely ridiculous."

And that's the printable stuff. Eleanor is dating movie producer Paul Eckstein. Professionally, she's gearing up to co-host a TV talk show with Moon Zappa, the daughter of the late

rockstar Frank Zappa and sister of Eleanor's ex-boyfriend, Dweezil.

**Q:** We're big fans of John Leguizamo, who was so great in "To Wong Foo: Thanks for Being Here, Julie Newmar." When do you think he'll break out as the star he deserves to be? —**ME**

**A:** John, 30, has a sense of humor about his career so far, rare in Hollywood acting circles. He's suffered small roles in big movies — his part as a nasty terrorist in "Die Hard 2" was slashed to a mere two lines — and big parts in duds ("Whispers in the Dark" and "Street Hunter"). But his role in the comedy "To Wong Foo" made Hollywood sit up. Leguizamo's latest release is "The Fan." He plays a baseball agent whose client (Wesley Snipes) has to contend with an unfriendly sports-writer (Ellem Barkin) and a stalking psych (Robert De Niro).

Last year, John eloped with longtime girlfriend Yelba to Las Vegas. The couple recently bought an entire building in New York's East Village.

**A:** As John puts it, "Making a fool of yourself (uncensored) says pretty well thanks."

**Q:** Whoopi Goldberg is said to be writing another children's book as a follow-up to "Alice." When will it be out? —**DJ**

**A:** Whoopi will again be writing another book, but this time it won't be for children. She's just signed a rumored \$5 million deal for a nonfiction book based on her take on things in life, some funny, some not.

It won't be published until next fall, but there's sure to be plenty of media hype to launch the book. Whoopi will undoubtedly make the talk show rounds at the time.

**Q:** The owner of our local video store tells me that Burt Reynolds is doing a porno film. Can you tell me if this is so? I should think it would ruin his career. —**KT**

**A:** The answer is yes and no. Reynolds, 60, is starring in a movie, due out next April, about a group of filmmakers who attempt to revolutionize the adult entertainment business. His co-stars include Julianne Moore and Mark Wahlberg. But I promise you, Reynolds is not acting in a blue movie nor will the film, "Boogie Nights," be X-rated.

**Q:** Is Julia Louis-Dreyfus making a movie instead of returning to "Seinfeld"? —**EA**

**A:** Well, Louis-Dreyfus, 35, was scheduled to shoot a film during the "Seinfeld" season, but her boss and co-star, Jerry Seinfeld, arranged for her work schedule to allow her to do both: So, yes, she'll be back for another season as Elaine. But a further complication arises now that Woody Allen wants her for his next film, which, naturally, shoots during the same period. So Elaine will be back on "Seinfeld" but not featured as prominently in story lines as in the past.

Woody Allen always is this one actress who will be mucking up frequent flyer miles.

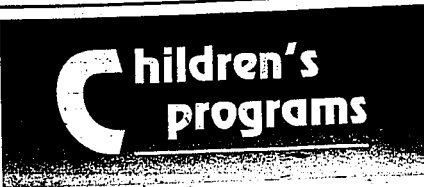

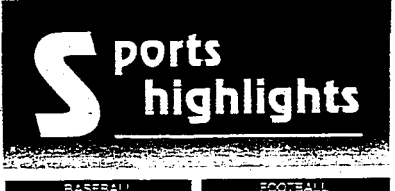

# Whul is agent for satire on HBO's 'ArtiSS'

So, you're a sports agent, representing the thoroughbred athletes with superbly developed bodies and egos, negotiating the big deals on their behalf with the owners of all the major teams.

On this particular day, you and your pitcher-client are dealing with one of the titans of baseball. Is it a problem that the guy you represent won only one game last season?

Not really. Cool as can be, you just hand the owner a contract calling for \$2 million next season. Two million? For one win?

Pepto-Bismol on the rocks for everyone. Such is the world of Artiss Michaels, played by Robert Whul in "ArtiSS," an HBO comedy he writes as well as produces. The series, scheduled initially for 11 episodes, began this month and continues Wednesday nights on the pay-cable service.

As an agent, Artiss is ethically challenged — that's part of what makes the show funny, of course — but "he genuinely cares about his clients," Whul said. "I'd like to have him as my agent."

The premise of the show is that Artiss Michaels has written a book recounting his exploits in sports agency. The half-hour sitcom tells the twists and turns behind the straight-forward book.

Beneath the humor lies an element of truth: Sports agents have situated themselves firmly in the middle of the owner-player equation.

"No doubt they've had an impact," said Whul, "just like they have in Hollywood. Women have responded to the show because they get to learn a bit."

Fine, but the show remains something of a guy thing, centered as it is on a male-dominated world.

The series is informed by Whul's deep interest in sports and the access his celebrity has given him to owners, general managers and players.

Take the front-office story: Whul picked up about the player who was so unhappy with a proffered contract that he made like he was about to urinate on it.

"Well," Whul recalled, "when I heard the story, I said, 'Fine, but on my show he'd do it.'" And he does.

Artiss is aided and abetted by his agency colleagues, played by Jim Turner, Sandra Oh and Michael Boatman. And the show is liberally laced with cameos from many of sport's brightest stars.

Whul has been a key player in two quality sports movies in recent years, "Cobb" and "Bull Durham." And if he looks at ease rubbing broad shoulders with the jocks and their owners in "ArtiSS," he should, because he does.

"Wayne's a friend of mine," he said matter-of-factly about Wayne Huizenga, the Miami Dolphins owner. "And I've known Dan for many years," he added, referring to the team's quarterback, Dan Marino.

But Whul expressed sadness over the retirement of Tommy Lasorda as manager of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

"He let me be the bat boy a couple of seasons ago," he recalled. "It was great. You saw the game within the game. The signs being stolen. What guys said on the bench. I'm going to miss him..."

Whul doesn't just keep his eyes and ears open when he's banging with his sports pals to come up with ideas. There's also his abundant imagination.

Take one of Artiss's problem clients, a New York Yankees idol in de-



ce played by Ken Howard of "White Shadow" fame.

"Artiss tries to get him a job on the radio," Whul said, "and it doesn't work out. Greater in Las Vegas; it doesn't work out. So Artiss goes on a home-shopping channel and sells the former great's sperm."

Far-fetched? They put horses out to stud, don't they?

"It's not crazy," said Whul, warming to the idea. "If Joe Montana went on home shopping, it would sell."

The show ultimately takes the viewer inside Whul's fertile imagination, a fun place to be, and inside sports — way inside — where not everyone may wish to be, a place as informative as it is funny.

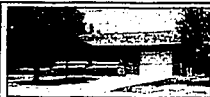

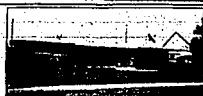
