# Investigators seek clues in fatal crash

## Mountain terrain slows efforts at site

JEROME — Jennie Moretti looked out the window at the Jerome airport, the gray day reflecting her mood.

"You always try to have hope, hope that maybe ...," said the airport manager's wife Thursday, her voice trailing off.

Hope ended Wednesday when she learned the fate of a familiar visitor to the airport. The wreckage of a plane flown by Ken Neace, and carrying his wife, Judy, and teen-aged daughter Brandy, was spotted in the rugged mountains southwest of Loman.

As authorities attempt the sad duty of bringing home the bodies, federal investigators gather information to piece together the flight's final moments.

"Everybody's just anxious for them to get them out," Moretti said.

"It could have happened to any of us," added her husband, Art Moretti, who glimpsed Neace driving into the airport Friday of last week.

The Neace family flew out in a single-engine Piper Comanche. The Neaces' destination was Pullman, Wash., to visit their son Blake at Washington State University. But the aircraft went down Friday afternoon.

Attempts to remove the bodies started Thursday, but the rugged terrain and avalanche dangers are obstacles, said Kurt Anderson, an investigator with the National Safety Transportation Board.

"There are no survivors," he said.

Boise County authorities reached the wreckage Wednesday but were not able to remove the bodies from the scene, Anderson said. About 7:20 a.m. Thursday, he heard county sheriff's crews were returning to the site.

# Temporary Nevada nuclear dump clears Senate panel; future murky

WASHINGTON — Legislation to dump nuclear waste in Nevada temporarily cleared the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee Thursday, but its prospects remain uncertain.

President Clinton already has said he would veto the legislation if it emerges from Congress, and Nevada's two senators said they were confident the measure did not have the two-thirds support to override a veto.

The bill was sent to the Senate floor by a 15-5 vote. It has yet to be scheduled for floor action.

"Congress is doing its part to help the federal government live up to the promise it's made to take responsibility for the waste," said Sen. Larry Craig, R-Idaho, a co-sponsor of the bill. "Now it's

time for the administration to step forward and work cooperatively with us."

The legislation, similar to a bill that passed the Senate last year but languished in the House, would direct the Energy Department to build a temporary dump in the Nevada desert to store high-level nuclear waste until a permanent one can be located and built.

Supporters argue that the government agreed to take waste — more than 30,000 tons so far — that has been building up at 31 sites in 31 states. The government nuclear power plants in 31 states. Please see NUCLEAR, Page A2

# GOP pushes vote on campaign reform

BOISE — A campaign finance reform bill which most Republicans like, Democrats hate and some people say is next to worthless, is headed toward a final vote in the House.

The measure already has cleared the Senate and Gov. Phil Batt supports it, meaning if the bill gets through the House in the final days of the 1997 session it likely will become law.

It was approved by the House State Affairs Committee Thursday.

The committee also gave routine approval to a companion bill that would create a new commission to study campaign finances, ethics and lobbyists. It would have five members — two former



judges, two former public officials and a fifth appointed by the other four.

But most of the committee's attention was on the campaign-finance bill.

"It's a good bill. It has been well thought through and it has been court-tested," said Sen. Evan Frasure, R-Pocatello.

"It's more than a token attempt at reform," Frasure said.

That's what Democrats contended, with their major objections aimed at a section that would require the Idaho Education Association and labor unions to get written permission every year from members to continue collecting checkoff dues for political purposes.

An effort to amend the bill failed 13-7 and it seems certain to pass the full House with the GOP majority pushing it.

It is not a perfect bill. There is much yet to be done," said GOP Majority Leader Rep. Bruce Newcomb. "It is a good step in that direction and I am ready to get started."

Rep. John Alexander, D-Pocatello, served notice he would continue his attempt to amend the legislation when it comes before the full House.

# Compromise on Indian gaming dies for session

BOISE — The watered-down compromise essentially preserving the status quo on Indian gambling in Idaho that cleared the state Senate earlier this week will not come to a vote in the House.

"It doesn't do anything," House Speaker Michael Simpson said late Thursday.

The bill will be left to die in the House

State Affairs Committee as well a meaningless, nonbinding petition for the federal government to enforce the state's gambling laws on the reservations.

Simpson said the House will approve a resolution endorsing the special task force Gov. Phil Batt has indicated he will set up to assess the entire issue of gambling.

The speaker said that since the Senate-passed legislation was a substitute for the proposition originally introduced a

month ago, the tribes should have the chance to testify on it in an open hearing. But with lawmakers intending to adjourn next week, Simpson said there simply was not enough time.

Critics contended even the revised proposition would poison negotiations with the tribes over gambling and widen the gulf between them and the state.

The House decision came after the compromise that merely restricting law on gambling cleared the Senate.

# Police say young Cosby slain in robbery try

## Russian-born teen-ager faces murder charge

LOS ANGELES — A Russian-born teen-ager gunned down Bill Cosby's son in a random robbery attempt, police said Thursday.

They confirmed his arrest came after a tipster called the National Enquirer in hopes of claiming a \$100,000 reward.

Mikhail Markhasev, 18, who came to the United States eight years ago, acted alone and "there was no indication that there is any Russian gang or Russian mob ties at all," police Chief Willie Williams told a news conference.

"It appears that robbery was the motive. It was happenstance,"

Williams said. "This was a random stop as far as we know now ... It happened to be a man in a car and the defendant who did not know under arrest happened to come by."

Williams also said investigators had seized the gun and the knit woolen watch cap believed used in the Jan. 16 slaying of Ennis Cosby, who was shot along a road as he changed a tire on his Mercedes convertible.

Ballistic tests on the gun confirmed it was the weapon used in the killing, Williams said. He said the gun and the hat were found last Friday after a search.

The chief noted that nothing appeared to have been taken during the robbery attempt, and the suspect apparently wasn't responsible for disabling Cosby's car.

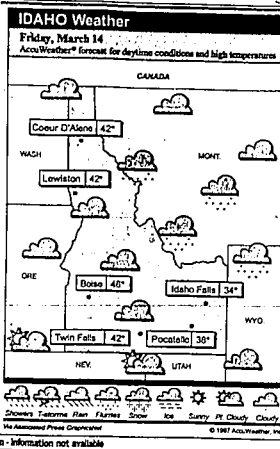
Markhasev, who was arrested Wednesday night at his suburban North Hollywood home, will be charged with one count of murder.

Two people brought in for questioning Wednesday night — a man and a woman — were released, Williams said.

**Rain, snow, freezing rain soak wide area as winter holds on**

Heavy rain fell across Arkansas and the Mississippi and Ohio valleys Thursday while a winter storm brought freezing rain and snow to the Midwest and the northern Plains.

As much as 3 inches of rain was expected in areas still dealing with flooding along the Ohio River and its tributaries, but forecasters said the new storm would cause floodwaters to rise only slightly.

To the south, thunderstorms brought rainfall at a rate of about 2 inches an hour to Louisiana and northern Florida but no major flooding was reported.

A mix of freezing rain and snow was falling across the Midwest and northern Plains.

Mason City, Iowa, was hardest hit with more than an inch of ice on the ground. Thunderstorms swept through town early Thursday and produced heavy freezing rain along with small hail and gusty wind. By afternoon, some of the ice had melted but freezing rain continued in the northeastern part of the state.

Moderate to heavy snow was falling from the Dakotas into Minnesota and northern Wisconsin, closing schools and highways. Parts of Wisconsin got 13 inches, while 6 inches fell in southern Minnesota. Before the storms ended, parts of Wisconsin could get up to 16 inches.

The rest of the country had quieter weather, with high pressure in control. Colder air was still spilling into the western Plains, and the combination of cold temperatures and gusty northerly winds was keeping wind chills as low as 30 below zero.

The combination of the cold air and moisture moving in from the West was producing snow across the northern Rockies.

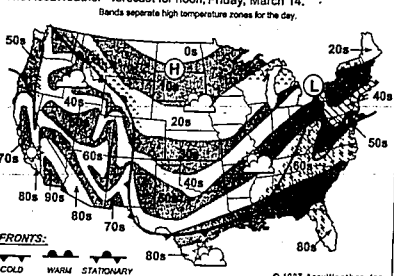

# Harassment guides clear young kisser

WASHINGTON (AP) — Johnathan Proven, the first-grader who was punished last year for kissing a girl at school, can put his mind at ease.

The Education Department declared Thursday that a peek on the cheek by a 6-year-old falls short of sexual harassment.

Issuing guidelines for schools or colleges that get federal dollars the department called upon the judgment and common sense of school officials when fighting harassment. The department told officials to consider the alleged offender's age.

"The factors in the guidance confirm that a kiss on the cheek

by a first-grader does not constitute sexual harassment," the department said, mentioning the case but not Johnathan's name.

"In order to give rise to a complaint... sexual harassment must be sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that it adversely affects a student's education or creates a hostile or abusive educational environment," the guidelines said. "For a one-time incident to rise to the level of harassment, it must be severe."

Johnathan was kept from his class in Lewiston, N.C., for a day and banned from the playground after kissing a classmate in September 1996.

# 40 Idahoans lose license for support non-payment

BOISE (AP) — Forty Idaho parents are having their driver's licenses suspended for failing to make arrangements to pay child support, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare announced.

The suspensions are the first under Idaho's license suspension

law that took effect Jan. 1. Collectively, the 25 men and five women whose licenses were ordered suspended owe \$794,578 in child support to 92 children, Health and Welfare said Thursday.

"We believe there has been plenty of time for these individuals to make arrangements to pay the past due child support," Mary Anne Saunders, the agency's special deputy for welfare reform.

Health and Welfare said more than 80 notices of intent to suspend have been sent statewide.

ernment, however, has no place to put the waste, mostly used reactor fuel.

The Senate bill calls for building a facility capable of holding 15,000 tons of waste initially and if needed eventually as much as 60,000 tons.

It also requires at least 5 percent of the waste dumped at the facility each year be noncommercial like the hundreds of tons of radioactive material now stored at the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory.

That provision, secured by Craig, is critical to helping the government fulfill its part of the unprecedented 1995 waste deal it cut with Idaho Gov. Phil Batt that requires removal of that INEEL waste by 2035.

Critics, including most Nevadans, argue that the temporary dump could easily become permanent if the permanent facility now sited for Yucca Mountain in Nevada proves unacceptable.

Committee Chairman Frank Murkowski, R-Alaska, one of the bill's authors, contended that the temporary dump could not even be opened if the permanent Yucca Mountain site turned out not to be viable.

"The temporary facility is needed, however, because the permanent one will not be ready until 2015 at the earliest, Murkowski said.

In the next two decades, waste now mostly stored underwater at reactor sites will double to 70,000 tons, according to industry estimates.

information to discover what might have caused the fatal accident.

Anderson has gathered audio tapes of radio transmissions between Neace and the Salt Lake City Flight Service Center, Anderson said.

"He called the Cedar City (Utah) Flight Center through his radio for a weather update and they have an audio tape of that," the investigator said.

Also on tape is the pilot's radio call to the Boise Flight Service Center for a weather briefing.

Through communications with federal aviation centers, they found that Neace reported icing on his aircraft and turning back,

but the plane inverted, Anderson said.

"We'll have all the radio transmissions so we'll have a pretty good idea of what went on up there," he said. They also have radar information about the "ground track" of the plane. "We get that from the Salt Lake Center, their radar picks him up and shows his altitude, air speed."

When conditions allow on the mountain, a team of federal investigators will study the wreckage and its flight control system to determine if any mechanical problems that brought down the plane.

Another part of the investigation is learning the maintenance

## Reno tried to tell Lake about China

WASHINGTON (AP) — Attorney General Janet Reno said she stopped trying to tell National Security Adviser Anthony Lake that China might try to influence the 1996 elections because she thought the FBI would pass the word.

Reno said in her regular Thursday news conference that she called Lake's office after receiving an FBI briefing last "May about the intelligence information. It was not able to reach Lake," Reno said, and she didn't pursue the matter further because "it was told the briefing went forward."

Both Lake and President Clinton have said they were not briefed about the FBI intelligence, which was given to two National Security Council officers.

The White House says one of the two said he was told not to pass the information to his superior. Clinton's statement Monday prompted an unusual public quarrel with the FBI, which issued its own statement contradicting the president.

Reno has called the episode a misunderstanding. "It was just the kind of a different understanding of what was said," she said. "There was no attempt by the FBI to restrict it within the NSC and (from) the appropriate chain of command at the White House."

While supporting the FBI's account, the attorney general indicated displeasure with the way the FBI publicly contradicted the president. "I know they were going to put out a statement, but I did not know what the content of the statement would be," the attorney general told reporters.

Asked if she would have softened the wording, Reno said she would have tried to "make sure that everybody had communicated and understood exactly what was said, what people's memories were."

A Justice Department official speaking on condition of anonymity said Reno telephoned Lake while traveling and did not leave a message when told the attorney adviser was away from his office.

The intelligence information spawned an investigation into whether the Chinese government tried to funnel campaign donations into U.S. congressional elections. After the information surfaced last June, the FBI warned six members of Congress that Chinese nationals might try to contact them.

## Clinton orders test for military kids

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — Calling in reinforcements to promote school standards, President Clinton ordered the Pentagon Thursday to require standardized tests in classrooms run by the military for its dependents.

The Defense Department, which operates 233 schools for 115,000 dependents of U.S. military personnel around the world, will join Maryland, Michigan and North Carolina in testing students against international standards by 1999.

NEW YORK (AP) — The FBI agent in charge of the TWA Flight 800 investigation acknowledged for the first time Thursday the plane could have been brought down by a shoulder-fired terrorist missile.

But so far, there is no evidence to prove that theory, James Kallstrom said. And he condemned as ridiculous a new flurry of claims that the jet was destroyed accidentally by the U.S. military.

"This terrible, terrible tragedy was not caused by our military," Kallstrom said in an interview with The Associated Press. "Our military, in particular the Navy divers, are the heroes of this operation — not the victims."

Investigators have focused on three possible explanations for the July 17 disaster: a bomb, a missile or mechanical failure.

Kallstrom said that it is "technically possible" a terrorist using a shoulder-fired, Stinger-type missile could have caused the tragedy, and he said investigators are examining that possibility. He would not elaborate on where a missile could have been fired from or provide other specifics.

The plane was 10 miles off-shore and more than 13,000 feet up at the time.

Kallstrom said there is no new evidence to support the terrorist missile scenario over other theories.

But he noted similar missiles have been used to down more than 25 commercial planes over the past two decades in places such as Africa, the Middle East and the former Soviet Union. Stinger-type missiles are designed specifically to shoot down planes.

Flight 800 exploded after take-off from Kennedy Airport, killing

all 230 people on board and scattering wreckage across a five-mile stretch of the Atlantic Ocean.

The missile theory has been bolstered by people who reported seeing something in the sky before the disaster.

"There were too many people who describe strange events like flares and streaks of light in the sky" to ignore the missile possibility, Kallstrom said.

Kallstrom's remarks came in a week rife with reports that a mis-

## Salinger theory — AB

Salinger offered an expanded version Thursday of his theory that a Navy missile shot down Flight 800. At a Paris news conference, he released a 69-page document and a set of radar images from a video.

The tape "completely confirms a missile fired down TWA 800," Salinger said.

Kallstrom said investigators long ago eliminated any "friendly fire" scenarios or the possibility of a military cover-up. The FBI reviewed radar and other sources to conclude the military could not have shot down the plane, he said.

## House gives Mexico ultimatum

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House voted Thursday to give Mexico 90 days to cooperate fully in the anti-drug war or lose its certification.

President Clinton is counting on the Senate to protect his outright acceptance of Mexico as a full partner in the war.

The 251-175 vote came on a bill that originally called for immediate decertification — a proposition that is losing ground in the Senate. Even if the resolution wins Senate approval, the House margin was far short of the two-thirds required to override an expected presidential veto.

"This is an effort on our part to help the people of Mexico, to help the people of Colombia and to help the American people," said House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga. Clinton decertified Colombia but certified Mexico as "fully cooperative" in fighting drugs.

The bill retains Clinton's right to waive sanctions against Mexico if he determines that is in the national interest.

The final vote was closer than the overwhelming defeat the Clinton administration expected. The vast majority of Democrats turned against it because it sharply criticized Clinton's anti-drug policies.

Rep. Lee Hamilton, D-Ind., who supported the original bill, said the 90-day provision also would put Mexican officials in a bind, with any effort to meet the congressionally imposed goals viewed as giving up on its sovereignty leading into a July 6 midterm election.

"It puts President (Ernesto) Zedillo into a real box," Hamilton said before the House voted 212-205 on the 90-day amendment. Rep. Benjamin Gilman, R-N.Y., chairman of the House

International Relations Committee, which voted 27-5 to decertify Mexico a week ago, said diplomatic relations "must not override the importance of fighting drugs in our bilateral relationship."

Rep. Tom Lantos, D-Calif., called the House bill an insult to Mexico and to Clinton. "Passing this ill-conceived legislation will make the Mexican government less likely to cooperate with us and it will make the Mexican people justifiably outraged," Lantos said.

The original House bill would have declared Mexico uncooperative in the anti-drug fight but allowed Clinton to waive sanctions — an option he already has. Presidential spokesman Mike McCurry said Clinton would not be surprised by defeat by a large majority in the House and was concentrating his efforts on the Senate. He met with several in the White House late Wednesday.

## Report: Ethanol subsidy doesn't work

WASHINGTON (AP) — Tax breaks for ethanol producers cost a federal highway trust fund \$7.1 billion, but the corn-based fuel has done little to reduce air pollution or enhance the nation's energy security, a congressional report says.

"This is a glaring example of a corporate subsidy that simply does not work," said Rep. Phil

English, R-Pa. English and Rep. John Lewis, D-Ga., have sponsored a bill to repeal the ethanol tax break, and have the backing of House Ways and Means Chairman Bill Archer, R-Texas.

"I have long considered the ethanol subsidy to be a wasteful use of tax dollars," Archer said Thursday.

Archer released a General Accounting Office study that said ethanol tax breaks have reduced income into the federal Highway Trust Fund, which pays for road, bridge and highway construction, by \$7.1 billion since 1979. Archer said the subsidy, if left in place, will cost the highway trust fund \$2.4 billion through the year 2000.

## Republican's bill would disclose HIV status

WASHINGTON (AP) — States would be required to alert people to possible contacts with HIV-infected individuals under a bill being advanced by a Republican congressman.

The measure also would create a national reporting system for the virus, require testing of anyone accused of a sex crime, require insurers to disclose HIV test results to applicants and allow disclosure of HIV status of children up to adoption.

Rep. Tom Coburn, R-Okla., said the provisions will protect those who aren't infected and help those who are learn their status as soon as possible so they can take advantage of new, life-prolonging treatments.

The proposal "will return sound medical practices to our nation's public health policy and curtail the spread of the deadly HIV epidemic," added Coburn, who also is a physician.

The American Medical Association, which represents doctors, supports the measure, as it has many of the bill's provisions.

But the Human Rights Campaign, a gay political group, said the bill would intrude on the authority of local public health officials and do nothing to help at-risk individuals change their behavior.

The bill would: Require confidential, national reporting of new HIV cases to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. States currently report

new AIDS cases, and 26 states report new cases of the virus.

Require states to notify people that they may have been exposed to HIV by a current or past partner. The CDC currently requires partner notification for AIDS cases.

Require HIV testing for accused sexual offenders.

Require insurers to reveal HIV test results to applicants, and permit people to learn the HIV status of children they may adopt.

# Army: IG will review harassment cases

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army's inspector general will review the outcome of sexual harassment cases that touched off accusations of misconduct on the part of the Army's own investigators, the service's top civilian leader promised lawmakers Thursday.

Army Secretary Togo West sought to assure members of a House National Security subcommittee that the military justice system can fairly investigate all issues in cases alleging sexual harassment.

On Tuesday, five female soldiers asserted that Army investigators had attempted to get them to falsely accuse their superiors of rape. The women were questioned as part of an Army investigation into widespread sexual misconduct at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.

West told lawmakers that at the conclusion of several upcoming cases at Aberdeen, he will ask the Army inspector general to review

the outcome to "protect the rights of all."

Meanwhile, Gen. Dennis Reimer, the Army's top general, said he is not aware of any misconduct on the part of the Army investigators looking into accusations of sexual harassment.

"No, I'm not aware of any pressure tactics at all," Reimer told reporters at the Pentagon.

The four-star general said that while he is not familiar with the specific cases, he is aware of the quality of the people who serve as investigators and the training they receive at the service's Criminal Investigative Command.

"I'm sure that the investigators were thorough in their investigation and they asked questions to determine what really took place. That's their job," Reimer said, adding, "It's supposed to be thorough, and they are supposed to be fair, and I have every confidence that they were."

At the Capitol Hill hearing, West said that the military officer already in charge of the sexual harassment investigations has the power to issue subpoenas, take testimony under oath and interview witnesses — including alleged victims and Army investigators.

"The fact is the best person situated to investigate ... is the general court-martial convening authority that has jurisdiction," he said.

"There is no way that these charges will not be investigated thoroughly soon," West told lawmakers.

On Wednesday, West rejected a call by the NAACP and the Congressional Black Caucus for an outside probe of assertions by the five white female soldiers at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., that Army investigators had tried to get them to falsely accuse their superiors, many of whom are black, of rape.

# U.S. begins evacuation from Albania


WASHINGTON (AP) — Faced with a deteriorating security situation, U.S. military helicopters began evacuating Americans from Albania Thursday.

State Department spokesman Nicholas Burns said four Chinook helicopters were flown to Tirana, the capital, from the U.S. fleet in the Ionian Sea and evacuated the first 50 Americans. At least 170 were due to follow.

Most of the evacuees were young children who are dependents of American employees. Burns said the evacuation will include all non-essential U.S. government personnel, their dependents and as many other American civilians as possible.

The embassy in Tirana will remain open with a core staff of 17 State Department officials.

# Federal judge rejects school prayer law

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP) — A federal judge struck down Alabama's school prayer law Wednesday, a ruling likely to be ignored in a Bible Belt state where politicians encourage religious expression in classrooms and courtrooms.

"I will be curious to see if the ruling is obeyed," said Michael Chandler, an assistant principal at Valley Head Middle School who fought the 1993 measure requiring all school-related events to permit "non-sectarian, non-proselytizing student-initiated, voluntary prayer."

Chandler and a student's mother contended the law forced teachers to allow students to pray out loud in class and give readings from the Bible, with students told to stand in the hall if they didn't want to take part.

U.S. District Judge Ira DeMent said the law violates the Constitution by creating "excessive entanglement" between religion and state

and leaving some students with "no choice but to listen to the prayers of their peers."

Gov. Fob James said through a spokesman that he believes the First Amendment allows every American to pray "whenever and wherever" and that he would not tell the people of Alabama to obey the ruling.

"I'm sure he would tell folks to have at it," said spokesman Alfred Sawyer.

The ruling comes at a time when James and other political figures have rallied behind a state judge in Gadsden who has been ordered to stop conducting prayers at the start of court sessions and to remove a carved display of the Ten Commandments from behind his bench.

James has said he would send in state troopers if necessary to support expressions of religious faith in Alabama courtrooms.

And already, another school prayer measure — requiring every teacher to start the day by

reading a prayer from the Congressional Record — is moving through the Legislature.

The Rev. Barry Lynn, director of Americans United for Separation of Church and State, which joined with the American Civil Liberties Union in filing the suit, said the governor's comments "seem to convey to everyone, including kids, that anarchy is better than obeying rules you don't believe in."

The judge, along with striking down the 1993 law, spelled out various forms of student religious expression that he said generally are permissible. They included: group prayers outside of organized classes and the wearing of religious symbols — even replicas of the Ten Commandments.

Rep. Bill Fuller, a Democrat who sponsored the 1993 law, said the ruling "devalues the role of prayer." Fuller said, "For the courts to discourage the advancement of spiritual values, I think grieves God."

# FDA OKs home blood-thinner test

WASHINGTON (AP) — Hundreds of thousands of patients who take the blood thinner Coumadin might get better control over blood clots with fewer doctor visits thanks to the first at-home test to ensure the drug is working properly.

But one expert on Coumadin said even though doctors have long wanted at-home testing, at \$2,000, the ProTime Microcoagulation

System may simply be too expensive to prescribe for the patients it could benefit most.

"Coming back to a doctor's office once a week is a major intrusion. ... It would be great to treat them at home," said Dr. Raymond Woosley of Georgetown University. But "that high cost is going to markedly limit the value of it."

### Fairgrounds plan needs intense public discussion

Seasonal revenue and year-round expenses have long been a problem for the Twin Falls County Fair and Rodeo. So fair officials are smart to look for ways to bring year-round revenue to the Filer fairgrounds.

But the idea they are pursuing - a \$7 million, taxpayer-built expo center - poses more risk than opportunity. They need to back up and gather more information before presenting any plan to Twin Falls County voters.

An expo center has obvious benefits. With flexible seating arrangements, the proposed facility could shelter crowds ranging from 2,500 to 8,000 for various events. It would let the community enjoy entertainment and trade shows that existing accommodations can't handle.

But the \$7 million price tag is a roadblock, especially when compounded by a short timetable for winning public support.

Fair leaders originally had considered holding a bond issue election in 1998. But they switched their focus to August '97 when they learned bond payments for the county jail were about to end. They hope to sell taxpayers on replacing the expiring jail tax with an expo center tax.

For the owner of a \$100,000 home, the center would cost about \$15.50 a year for 20 years. Those payments would be a bit smaller than the current jail payments - so taxpayers could approve the expo center and still see taxes decline.

Fair leaders hope that arithmetic will help sell their proposal. But what fair leaders see as a window of opportunity may really be a trap, enticing them to burn energy and community goodwill on an insufficiently researched plan.

Though the tax-replacement idea can be a useful incentive for voters, it won't sell a project on its own. Any project must be persuasive on its own merits.

So far, this one isn't. Fair officials have not demonstrated a community need for this facility. Nor can they predict its benefits.

Fair Manager John Pitz estimates that the expo center would be used about 15 days each month, clearing maybe \$70,000 a year. That money would surely go a long way toward maintaining and upgrading the fairgrounds' aging facilities.

But \$70,000 is only a 1 percent annual return on the taxpayers' \$7 million investment. No private investor would take that deal.

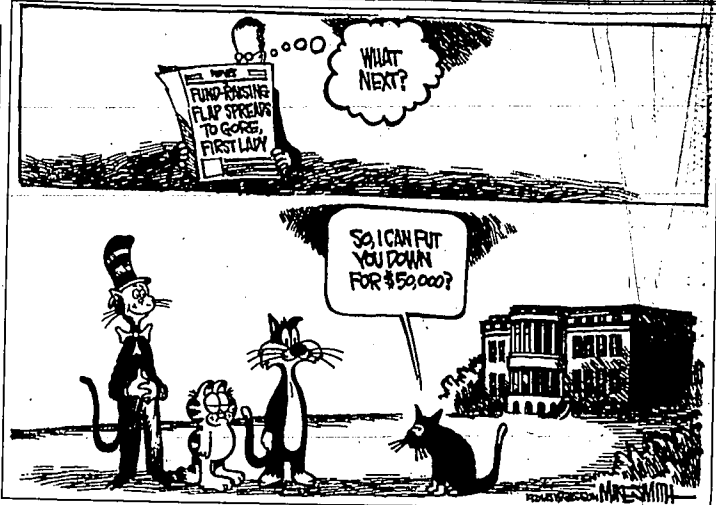
Of course, direct revenue is only a part of the hoped-for benefits from an expo center. It presumably would attract visitors, who would spend money on hotels, meals and other services.

But fair officials have no estimate of those presumed benefits. And even if they had one, would Twin Falls County homeowners and farmers pay additional property taxes to benefit hoteliers and restaurateurs?

Rather than rush an August election that probably will fail, fair officials should give themselves ample time to measure community desires on this issue. Do Twin Falls County taxpayers want to invest in an expo center? Do they think attracting ice shows and livestock expos would be worth the expense? Is the fairgrounds the best location?

An extensive community dialogue should be the first step. A professional study of potential economic benefits should come next, followed by more community dialogue. Only then should fair officials float a specific proposal.

All of this will take much longer than fair officials have in mind today. But it has a better chance of success than a hasty timetable dictated by political opportunity.



### White House excuses are unbelievable

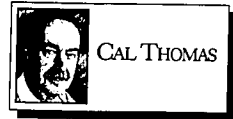
I f forced to choose between the Federal Bureau of Investigation, with all of its recent flaws, and the Clinton White House, which is nothing but flawed, who would you be more inclined to believe in a dispute involving who is telling the truth?

The president claims he was never told about alleged attempts by the Chinese government to penetrate the American electoral system and that the FBI instructed the National Security Council staff during a briefing not to tell him. But the FBI issued a statement denying the president's account and insisting it had "placed no restrictions whatsoever on the dissemination of the chain of command at the NSC or any information provided to the NSC senior staff."

I'll go with the FBI on this one. Besides, the president repeatedly assures us that neither he nor his campaign did anything illegal, so why the fuss if he really is telling the truth?

The excuses, whining and attempts to spread the guilt to Republican fund-raising tactics are beginning to fail as a strategy. The opinion polls, the only standard the president apparently cares about, are finally beginning to reflect the public's concern that while all politicians may be suspect, this president is more suspect than others. The public may not like the way fund raisers are raised for political campaigns, but it dislikes in the extreme the prostituting of America's good name to Chinese whose brothers-in-arms slaughter and otherwise oppress their own people.

The Clinton White House isn't yet in a panic, but it's getting close. The once impenetrable wall of confidence which reflected the attitude that nothing can touch this president is beginning to reveal a large crack. The president has survived reports of alleged extra-marital affairs, draft-dodging, sexual harassment,

double-talking and double-mindedness on a range of issues, including events collectively known as Whitewater. Now he faces a scandal that could eclipse the rest and which the public can easily comprehend. It may prove to be the biggest electoral hiccup in political history, involving sleazy tactics in the selling of access.

The arrogance of this bunch is astonishing. Statements from current and former administration officials, including former chief of staff Leon Panetta, indicate that the administration believed virtually anything was justified to defeat Republicans because the GOP would starve the elderly and ruin the country. So the Clinton-Gore re-election team, believing it had the "anything goes" green light from the president and first lady, may have even sold seats on the president's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board. Two men who contributed more

than \$200,000 to the Democratic National Committee between June 1995, and May, 1996, now have blanked access to files containing secret intelligence.

The cynicism of the fund-raisers was unlimited. The Washington Post reported that the Cheyenne-Arapaho Indians of Oklahoma contributed \$107,000 to the Clinton-Gore re-election effort. They hoped the money would buy favorable administration action on the return of their tribal lands. What it got them was a solicitation for more money and an offer from a Gore fund-raiser to lobby the administration in exchange for a \$100,000 retainer, a percentage of all royalties from mineral rights on the land and a \$10,000 per month fee. And they say Republicans are the party of the rich!

Mrs. Clinton has helped move White House explanations from the ludicrous to the laughable. Asked whether she made any fund-raising calls from the White House, she invoked her Whitewater defense: "I don't recall making any." Mrs. Clinton also offered this explanation for why the president "allowed" nearly 1,000 people, many of them donors, to spend the night at the White House: "Anyone who knows my husband knows he enjoys people. He counts thousands, if not hundreds of thousands, of people among his friends."

Most people would be happy to call Clinton one or two individuals, friend. The Clinton definition of friendship is apparently rather superficial.

It was once reported (erroneously) that former Nixon aide Charles Colson would run his own government after he became president. The Clinton people apparently were prepared to allow the Chinese communist government to run over their own country in pursuit of a second Clinton term.

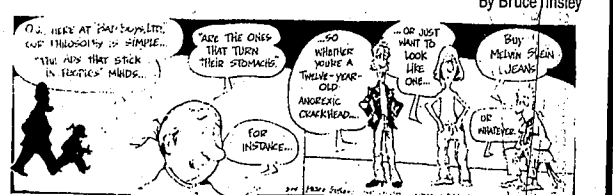

# Panel rejects \$394.4 million bond for road work

BOISE (AP) — A Senate committee Thursday refused to endorse a \$394 million bond issue to improve Idaho's major north-south highway link, often referred to as the "goat trail."

The Transportation Committee fell one vote short of clearing the House-passed proposal to upgrade U.S. 95 for a final legislative vote on the floor of the Senate.



"I think there are alternatives," eastern Idaho Republican Bob Lee told the rest of the committee.

The major stumbling block was the 4-cent-a-gallon hike in the fuel tax and the \$12 increase in annual registration fees for light trucks and cars, subject to voter approval in 1998. It would have brought in \$34 million a year to pay off the bonds, but lawmakers were leery because of their approval just a year ago of a 4-cent fuel tax hike and an average registration fee increase of \$7.

Fuel jobbers were especially critical, claiming that every fuel tax increase makes Idaho diesel fuel less competitive, so truckers buy fuel in border states before entering Idaho to save money. Revenues from the tax are not affected since truckers are billed the tax for the miles they drive in the state, not the fuel they buy. But it does reduce revenue for Idaho fuel sellers.

"We're not voting on a 4-cent fuel tax increase," Council Republican Judi Danielson said. "We're voting on whether to put it on the ballot."

But Lee argued that the public vote merely shifted the decision into the campaign arena, where 30-second sound bites rather than a solid discussion of the issue would determine the outcome.

Advocates of the bonding proposal maintained public safety and Idaho's commercial health were at issue. But skeptics contended that U.S. 95, running the length of western Idaho from Canada to Nevada, represents only a fraction of the state's \$4 billion in unmet road construction needs.

Transportation Department officials said they will complete another analysis of the east-west U.S. 30 corridor that will recommend hundreds of millions in work on that route.

"I recognize the problem we have, and it's pretty dang mammoth," Committee Chairman Evan Frause, R-Tocatello, said.

## Student's JonBenet art stirs controversy

DENVER (AP) — The first panel contains the word "Look" and an arrow pointing to a second panel, where three color copies of a photo of JonBenet Ramsey rest below the words "Daddy's Little Hooker."

Displayed on the University of Colorado campus, the piece angered some people enough for it to be torn down twice. On Wednesday, art student Paul Hidalgo remounted the display, which he hoped would "raise issues about child pageantry."

"The ethics and morality behind them must be questioned. Exposing young and impressionable children to this very adult and superficial institution is a terrible thing," Hidalgo said in a telephone interview from the Boulder campus.

A spokesman for the Ramsey family was outraged.

"Trying to sully the good name of a wonderful 6-year-old child who lost her life in a horrible way is not merely tasteless, it is disgusting and vulgar," Patrick Korren said.

Hidalgo, 21, said the project, which cost him \$100 in supplies, had been torn down twice since it went up Monday.

Because of copyright concerns, Hidalgo would not comment on his use of the photograph, which came from Newsweek magazine. It shows JonBenet in a white dress with full makeup and a crown of white flowers in her hair.

Karen Wheeler, a Newsweek spokeswoman, said Thursday it did not own the copyright to the photo but had merely purchased rights to publish it a single time.

University of Colorado Fine Arts interim chair Merrill Lessley said he finds the temporary display hurtful and disturbing, but he supported the student's constitutional right to use the space.

"For centuries, artists have taken on provocative subjects.

This work is no different," Lessley said.

JonBenet's body was found Dec. 26 in the basement of her family's Boulder home. The 6-year-old beauty queen was strangled and may have been sexually assaulted, authorities have said.

An investigation into her death continues. No suspects have been named and no arrests have been made.

At their weekly briefing in Boulder Thursday, authorities said they have hired an outside investigator to assist them.

Andrew "Lou" Smit, a retired Colorado Springs police captain, will be a liaison between Boulder police and District Attorney Alex Hunter, police spokesman Kelvin McNeill said.

Smit will be involved directly in the case and will follow it from the police investigation to the district attorney's office, McNeill said.

## Raid finds 34 undocumented workers

RIGBY (AP) — The U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service arrested 34 illegal aliens in the third raid at a local potato shipping and warehouse business in nine months.

The raid early Wednesday morning at the Taylor Produce warehouse came after immigration officers received an anonymous tip that the business was employing undocumented workers, said

Randolph Robinson, assistant director for investigations in the agency's Helena, Mont., office.

With increased funding in 1996, Robinson said the Immigration and Naturalization Service returned about 75 eastern Idaho workers to Mexico last year. The agency already is approaching that number this year. Thirty-two workers were rounded up in Idaho Falls and Ucon alone in January.

## 'Official state vegetable' is a hot potato issue

**JEROME** - School teacher Josie Gott hasn't given up hope that state lawmakers will proclaim the potato as Idaho's official vegetable.

On behalf of her fourth-grade students, she plans to fax lawmakers on the Senate Agricultural Affairs Committee to plead the merits of her students' case.

"We're starting our campaign over again," she said.

Worried, however, that the potato will go the way of the rattlesnake, she is preparing her students at Horizon Elementary School for disappointment.

Earlier in the legislative session, Meridian schoolchildren asked legislators to declare the rattlesnake as Idaho's official reptile - only to suffer a painful defeat.

Like the rattlesnake, the idea of an official state vegetable isn't popular with legislators who contend the bill wastes time and unnecessarily disappoints children.

The House passed the measure, House Bill 232, by a vote of 54-15. The bill is now languishing in the senate committee with slim chances for revival, Rep. Maxine Bell, R-Jerome, the potato bill's sponsor, said Thursday.

The committee may debate the bill today, but if they don't, chances are it will be left to rot, she said.

Gott planted the seed after an Idaho history textbook pointed noting that the potato is not an official state vegetable.

Her fourth-graders have been checking the bill's progress on the Internet at school.

"The kids are kind of on edge, it is kind of a waiting game," Gott said.

Bell said she has bent the ear of every politician she can think of who might support the measure. She hopes the committee will debate the bill instead of ignoring it totally.

"At least that gives the children closure," she said.

Nevertheless, Gott has braced her students for defeat.

"I told them this is a democratic society and you're going to have some people who are for your idea, and some who think it is not worthy, but you did what you could and you did your best," Gott said.

Adults may take the news a little harder, however, she said.

"You may see me in tears when it doesn't pass," she said.

## First lady on the block

### Serving up Mexican cuisine with a flair

**BELLEVUE** - Belinda Colunga, 30, learned to toss tortillas in her stepmother's New Mexico kitchen when she was a child waist high to her tutor.

Sack then, she had no idea those tortillas would help bridge a cultural gap in the Wood River Valley 20 years later.

Today, the first Hispanic businesswoman to stake a claim on Bellevue's Main Street serves her authentic Mexican fare to the valley's growing Spanish-speaking population and its celebrities alike. Expect to hear two languages bantered about in Colunga's La Norrenita Cafe, a stone's throw from Bellevue's General Store.

She appeared at the Environmental Resource Center in January as a speaker and panel member on Blaine County growth. Colunga broke ground as the valley's first female Hispanic business owner, but there are no Hispanic members of any government body in the valley, including Bellevue's and Hailey's councils and planning and zoning boards.

This winter afternoon, Colunga is preparing for the dinner hour and making tortillas - she makes and sells 10 dozen a day. Her 5-year-old daughter plays with a non-Spanish-speaking customer. Colunga switches from Spanish to English as fast as a blink.

Colunga is a busy woman. She now has a phone, adding to her orders. Next month, a liquor license is expected to come her way. Her cafe serves 40-60 meals daily, on average.

As far as cultural differences, she's glad everyone dines together at her restaurant, where the lights are too bright and the tables too close for much distinction.

She hopes the closeness spills over to the community.

"There's good in all of us, bad in all of us, that's simple," said Colunga, disturbed by inklings of prejudice against her cultural brothers and sisters. The Wood River Valley, especially Bellevue, has experienced an influx of Hispanic growth in the last 10 years.

The U.S. Census Bureau has no clear data on the valley's growing Hispanic population, but the Blaine County School District - through its English as Second Language program - has a pulse on its growth, school officials say. The program started with four students in 1990. Last year the number jumped to 180.

Colunga, a Catholic, attends Spanish-speaking mass at St. Charles Catholic Church in Hailey. There Father Tom Keller holds Spanish mass every other Friday. The church also hosts English classes throughout the year. Several Blaine County teachers are bilingual. Bellevue's marshal is Spanish-speaking, but no member of valley police forces is bilingual.

Colunga said she was surprised last Christmas, when the holidays rolled around. Tamales are a festival treat, but her Anglo customers eat them all year long, she said.

On her menu is real Mexican food.

**TWIN FALLS** - The mother of all local public meetings was called to order Thursday afternoon and, by the time it was over, the cities and counties of Jerome and Twin Falls had pledged to work together.

One by one, Kleinkopf cited Twin Falls County Commission Chairman Brent Reinke and the mayors of Twin Falls and Jerome to formally convene public meetings. One by one, the various groups unanimously authorized their leaders to sign the agreement.

Bliss students earn trip to Washington, D.C.

BLISS - A crash course on the Constitution has earned 13 Bliss high school students a trip to Washington, D.C., in April. The class, led by government teacher Robby Sauer, went to Boise Tuesday and won the state competition of We The People, a program funded by the U.S. Department of Education. For seven weeks, juniors and seniors in Sauer's elective class put in extra hours to study the Bill of Rights, development of political parties, the Supreme Court, history of the Constitution and other aspects of U.S. government. The Bliss students worked hard and were committed to the project, Sauer said. "And obviously, it's paid off," he said. "Now we have five weeks to prepare for national competition and a whole new set of questions." In the final round this week against a team from Pocatello, Bliss won five of six units of questions. There, he and the students met and talked with Supreme Court Justice David Souter and

"I understand the process (of the contest) better than I would have if I had just gone to school," and so hopefully I'll be able to pass that on to the students and help them be more prepared by the time they get to Washington." Next year's team from Idaho finished in the top 25, he said, adding, "We definitely want to improve upon that. Our goal is to make it into the top 10 because the top 10 compete on the final day at the Capital Building." Congress has appropriated funds for 50 teams, one from each state, to travel to the U.S. capital for national competition. But the students have to pay about \$500 each for their own lodging, food, tour bus and other expenses. In addition to their extra study, Sauer said, his students will be busy trying to raise money for the April 25-29 trip. 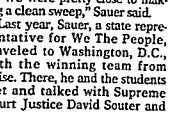

Her clientele includes movie stars and tourists, locals and transplants. For the dark-eyed entrepreneur, the business is paying off. Colunga said rent is high, the valley is expensive, but she's turning a profit and expects to keep growing.

 couldn't afford to maintain it, said BLM Outdoor Recreation Planner Bill McNally. Budget cuts and vandalism have increased the problems at Milner, he said.  
 "The vandalism never stops. The trash never stops," he said.  
 Traffic counters documented 87,400 vehicles passing through the area in 1996, which realistically translates to 20,000 to 30,000 visitors, said Blaine Newman, outdoors recreation planner for the BLM.  
 The agency estimates it will collect about \$3,000 in fees from June to September this year, he said.  
 The BLM's plan generated some skepticism and a little lambasting at Wednesday's meeting of the Cassia County Public Lands Committee.

# NATION IN BRIEF

## Kerby formally announces candidacy

BOISE — Promising to involve teachers, administrators and trustees in policy making, New Plymouth Schools Superintendent Ryan Kerby formally launched his candidacy for state schools superintendent Thursday. He joins state Rep. Ron Black of Twin Falls as Republicans challenging incumbent GOP Superintendent Anne Fox in the May 1998 primary election. Kerby said he had not been able to talk with Fox about his complaints with her administration. Kerby said that if elected he would take advantage of the experience and expertise of other education professionals and school board members while seeking more cooperation with the business community. Fox has been criticized for allegedly paying little attention to concerns about how she runs the Education Department and to how her policies affect local schools.

## BLM compromises on Owyhee event

CALDWELL — A motorcycle racing group and the Bureau of Land Management have called a truce in a three-month conflict that organizers feared would ruin a weekend event in Owyhee County. Bill Walsh of Caldwell, president of a local dirt-bike racing club called Dirt Inc., claimed the BLM arbitrarily rejected portions of his proposed 100-mile course for Sunday's race. The "Rabbit Creek National," sponsored by the Southwestern Idaho Desert Racing Association, is one of Idaho's biggest dirt bike races. It is part of a seven-race series in the West sanctioned by the American Motorcycle Association. BLM officials said they approved most of Walsh's course, but rejected the proposed use of several environmentally sensitive areas where research showed motorcycle trails formerly did not exist.

## Memorial Hospital administrator steps down

WEISER — Dr. Philip Krueger, a Boise gynecologist, has resigned as administrator of Memorial Hospital only a little more than three months after being appointed. Krueger became interim administrator on Nov. 20 and was offered a one-year contract in December. But the hospital's board of directors issued a statement this week saying based on staff concerns it had become clear "that difficulties encountered with scheduling administrative and surgical duties were insurmountable."

# Wage raise may hurt tipped employees

BOISE (AP) — Two waitresses say a bill that would raise the state minimum wage to match the federal standard will cost them and other tipped employees money. "It will make the poor even poorer," said Evelyn Wise. After the hearing Thursday, the House State Affairs Committee put off a decision until today.

Wise and Cheryl Shuart said the legislation would lower the actual cash that must be paid to tipped employees. "Consider the effects of Senate Bill 1087 on families and taxpayers," said Shuart, of Melba. "In reality, it will be a 10 percent decrease in wages." The bill cleared the Senate on a 31-1 vote Feb. 12, but only came up in the House for a hearing more than a month later. It is supported by the Idaho Hospitality Association and the Idaho Association of Commerce and Industry.

It raises the state minimum to \$4.75 per hour April 1 and to \$5.15 after Sept. 1. The business groups seemed attracted by a provision that allows employers to pay a minimum wage of \$4.25 per hour to employees under the age of 20. That would be allowed only for the first 90 days of employment. Dave Hand, lobbyist for the hospitality association, said, "We spent a great deal of time and money on this bill, negotiating on it." He called it an important step toward bringing state standards

into line with the federal minimum wage requirement. The state minimum wage now requires a cash payment to tipped employees of at least 25 percent below the minimum wage, but cash plus tips must equal at least the minimum wage. The legislation would increase the tip credit to one-third on April 1 and to 35 percent on Aug. 31.

Wise and Shuart said that will cost them money, because they often work during their shift at cleanup or preparation, which does not bring tips. The minimum cash payment for tipped employees under state laws now is \$3.19 per hour, would remain about the same after April 1 and would move to \$3.35 per hour after August.

The federal cash minimum is \$2.13 per hour. Rep. Jim Stoicheff, D-Sandpoint, called the bill a "savage attack on waitresses, who don't make enough to live anyway."

It's impossible to estimate how much a waitress would make in tips, because it depends on the time of day, restaurant quality and other factors, Shuart said. She said that in a six-hour shift she can make up to \$40, but \$10 to \$20 also is possible. State Affairs Chairman Ron Crane, R-Caldwell, said after the meeting that sponsors of the legislation spent some time with the women discussing the bill and they appeared less opposed to it after that session.

## Prison vs. schools dispute continues

BOISE (AP) — A bipartisan majority in the state Senate Thursday quelled yet another rebellion against skyrocketing prison costs that siphon cash from public and higher education.

On a 28-6 vote, the Senate refused to authorize shifting 2.5 percent of the Correction Department's 1998 budget — about \$1.7 million — to public school support, if overall state finances are still on their currently projected track next September.

"It's time for the state to have a face-off between education and incarceration," Republican Sen. John Anderson of Boise declared. Republican Floor Leader James Risch of

Boise acknowledged the "frustration that all of us feel with the escalating cost of incarceration, our inmates. It is a budget, however, that the people of this state demand."

While state aid to public schools still claims nearly half of all general tax expenditures, its share of that budget has dropped over the past decade from more than 52 percent to less than 49 percent. At the same, the share for prisons rose from 2.6 percent to over 4 percent.

And in the pared-down, \$1.4 billion 1998 general tax budget, \$69 million is earmarked for the Correction Department, up 13.4 percent from the \$60.8 million originally authorized in the current budget.

## Tax credit dropped

BOISE (AP) — Sponsors of an effort to win state tax credits for children who don't use the public schools agreed Thursday to back off. "We've just run out of time," said Henry Kulczyk of the Idaho Family Forum.

The conservative Christian organization has been behind a bill to grant parents who send their children to church, private or home schools credits against the income tax they owe.

The bill originally asked for \$1,000 per child. This week, though, the House amended it to \$500 per child, with a maximum of \$2,500 per family per year. Republicans emerged from a closed-door caucus Thursday to announce they expect to end the 1997 session by Tuesday.

## Suspect connected to kidnap attempts

COEUR D'ALENE (AP) — Police have arrested a Careywood man in connection with at least one of four recent attempts to abduct children in the Coeur d'Alene area.

Timothy Ray Krahrmer, 22, was arrested Wednesday and charged with one count of sexual abuse of a child under the age of 16.

He is being held on \$50,000 bail. Police said additional felony charges could follow.

Police Capt. Carl Bergh said Krahrmer was picked out of a photo montage by the victims of four alleged child abduction attempts.

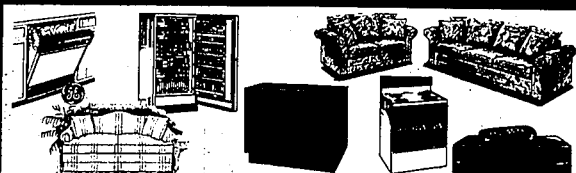

Zap Mama blends sounds of several continents

KEN SCHAPHORST AND VARIOUS ARTISTS "Over the Rainbow: The Music of Harold Arlen" (Accurate) 4 stars

Seeing the classic movie "The Wizard of Oz" may never be the same for anyone who listens to these unusual and uniformly interesting jazz interpretations of Harold Arlen songs, including several from the 1939 film.

This inventive and intriguing CD contains unusual instrumental combinations, arrangements and tonalities on 13 1930s-'40s-'50s Arlen songs.

Schaphorst — formerly from Boston, now teaching at Lawrence University in Appleton, Wis. — has arranged 13 Arlen tunes for such Boston-area and Accurate Records artists as the intriguing trios Medeski (John), Martin (Billy) & Wood (Chris), and Perfumed Scorpion; the 10-piece Ether/Orchestra; vocalist Janet Planet; alto-saxist Charlie Kohlhase's quieter; a nonet named Dadadah; and Schaphorst, himself.

MM&W — organist Medeski, drummer Martin, bassist Wood — do an eerie, Latin-funk "Out of This World," a haunting "Lullaby," a schizo "Ac-cent-tchu-ate the Positive" and a bluesy, shuffling "Life's Full of Conse-

quencies." Scorpion (trumpeter John Carlson, bassist Doug Yates, alto/bass clarinetist John Diro) is just as quirky on a swinging "Ping-Pong! the Witch is Dead," chamberlike, dissonant "The Man That Got Away" and rousing boogie-woogie-ish "Get Happy."

E/O offers a stormy "Stormy Weather"; Dadadah (with the soprano voice of Kitty Brezellan) delivers a spooky "That Old Black Magic"; trombonist Curtis Hasselbring leads a trio in a cheerful "Tve Got the World on a String."

ZAP MAMA "???" (Luaka Bop/Warner Bros.) 4 stars

I don't recall who coined the old adage that writing about music is like dancing about architecture, but it really hits home when trying to describe what's so marvelous about Zap Mama. "Listen and see" is too pat a response, so I'll try putting my praise into words.

Zap Mama is the performing moniker of Marie Daulne, a woman of Belgian and Zairean lineage who blends the sounds of several continents in her music. "???" is actually her third album,

but it's a tremendous leap forward for Daulne, who wrote, arranged and produced the bulk of this multicultural stew.

It's as if Daulne docked in every tropical port of call outside Asia and gleaned a little bit of the native music of each to help express her ideas and emotions. The African stylings are both traditional and contemporary, complemented by rap, reggae, funk, soul and the blues. What could have been a mere grab bag of influences instead becomes a moving experience, both emotionally and physically, thanks to Daulne's superior songwriting and adept production skills.

While some may maintain the occasional angry white man (and the occasional angry white woman) rule the rock universe, I believe the brilliant blending of many musics will be where true genius emerges in coming years, and Zap Mama is one of the artists at the vanguard of the movement.

U2 "Pop" (Island) 3 1/2 stars

Somewhere along the line, "popular music" turned into "pop music" and became an all-encompassing description for all things unclassifiable rock, country, R&B, hip-hop, disco, punk, funk and, now, electronics. At its most effective, pop is a dialogue

between the past and future that defines, and is completely of, the moment. So what else could U2 have titled its latest stab at greatness?

Like all visionary-slash-chameleonic artists, from David Bowie to Neil Young to Prince, U2 have remained creatively restless, and seek to reinvent themselves at every turn. This time, the group tapped into their techno-trance-ambient roots that have percolated since "Zooropa" and "Achtung Baby." "Pop" was emotionally with Howie B, the guru of Britain's underground deejay culture. Lyrically, Bono is at his provocative best, spraying out images of God, sex and the gutter like a volley of keyboard beats, or kaleidoscope strobe lights bouncing off a disco ball. The standouts are the minimalist "Miami," the anthemic "Gone," the rave first single "Discotheque" and the apocalyptic one-two of "If God Will Send His Angels" and "Wake Up Deadman."

For U2, they still haven't found what they're looking for, and the sound of that search is raw, fun and altogether ephemeral: "Pop" (a.k.a. "Newer Adventures in Hi-Fi") is that rare work of art that creates a hunger in its listeners every bit as voracious as in its makers'. —Jim Walsh

# Money: The day rock died? Fuhrman tells his take: Tapes were fictional voice

In "The Mansion on the Hill" (Times Books, \$25), Fred Goodman shows how rock and roll transformed the music industry from a comparatively modest \$500 million business in 1962 to the \$20 billion global money-making enterprise it is today.

Along the way, he argues, the music has been altered — mostly for the worse.

The rock and roll Goodman remembers as he was coming of age in the 1960s was a raucous, raucous language boomers with a "secret" language they could use to understand the world and to dream of remaking it into a different, and perhaps even better, place.

But "The Mansion on the Hill" isn't the story of the triumph of rock and roll idealism. Quite the opposite. It's a saga of lost innocence, how the culture that gave way to the culture of business. Or, as the longtime music biz reporter and critic puts it: "The question — at least to someone my age — is no longer 'Will rock and roll change the world?' but 'How did the world change rock and roll?'"

Goodman tells the tale through the prism of the careers of classic crooners Bob Dylan, Neil Young and Bruce Springsteen, and that of music business mogul David Geffen.

The book's central parable is the rise of Geffen from entertainment industry wannabe in the mailroom of the William Morris Agency to exalted status as billionaire mogul, philanthropist, and partner in Dreamworks SKG with Steven Spielberg and Jeffrey Katzenberg.

It's an ascendancy that Goodman portrays as representative of the victory of commerce over art. Indeed, Geffen's entrance into the Los Angeles music scene as a manager of singer-songwriters Laura Nyro and Jackson Browne is described by Paul Rothchild of Elektra Records as "the beginning of the end of the love, groove in American music."

## Book on tape gives sensitive portrayal

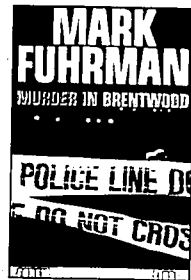

Mark Fuhrman says it's OK to take-record our hour-long interview. Then he smiles and asks, "This isn't for a screenplay, is it?" He lowers his mouth to inches above the recorder and mumbles, "OK and then I give you a ticket..."

He is very relaxed for being Mark Fuhrman, the bad cop, the bad person, the bad memory. He is recrossing the country, explaining and apologizing over and over again for the racial slurs and threats he put on tape during a screenplay project.

He is feeling good because he is getting to tell his side after two

years of self-imposed exile in Sandpoint, Idaho. Whether peo-

ple listen, believe or care is up to them, he says.

His account is a fascinating mix of confession, context, catharsis and counter-punch — some would say rationalization and revisionist history.

He is clear-spoken, tough-talking, a little cocky and sometimes fed-up angry. He has made the national broadcast circuit, co-wrote with Oprah, conversational with "Dateline," combative with former O.J. Simpson lawyer Alan Dershowitz on CNN's "Crossfire," and charming while knocking Larry King's softball out of the park.

People seem to be ready to hear him out. His recently released book, "Murder in Brentwood" (Regency, \$24.95), is No. 3 on the New York Times bestseller list, according to the publisher.

Far too many trees have died already for the Simpson case, but Fuhrman's book seems justified.

He fell from super cop to perjurer, racist and perhaps a reanimator for a verdict much of America believes was wrong. And he did it on national television.

His children, 5 and 3 years old, spent a year dodging media cameras.

One day he will have to tell them why he is so famous. He says he has saved every article, book, magazine and 70 lengthy broadcast reports about him and the case. He has thousands of letters. Eventually, he will give them to his children.

"I don't just want them to know what happened, I want to give them a little education in life," he says.

"I'll say, 'Here's the way the media spun it. Here's the way race was improperly used. Here's what we found out two years later. Here's what Dad wrote. And guess what, Dad was right. Race shouldn't

have been in the case, and this guy murdered these people."

Fuhrman, born in Tacoma, Wash., and raised by a single mother who moved to several small Washington and Nevada towns, says he is ashamed and sorry for those audio tapes. But he insists they were the words of a fictional character he was creating for a screenplay project and should have been irrelevant to both his character and Simpson's guilt.

It was trying to give Hollywood the gritty street-cop talk, he says.

Well, is this the way they talk? No, he says.

"When I first came on job and worked South Central L.A., I saw what it does when someone is called that and how a bad situation can get worse real quick. There are a whole bunch of names you can call people that are just as demeaning. You don't have to get into racial stuff."

## New parenting guide fills in where some other books leave off

You tell your boys that you don't approve of weapons, but they determine to pretend they're shooting guns.

You think skinny, busty Barbie is an affront to real women's bodies, but your daughter's beset by Barbiemania.

You'd want to know why his playmate has two moms and no dad; why a homeless person is sleeping in a doorway; whether someone's brown skin means he's dirty.

In addition to these "contemporary" issues, you're also dealing with such "old-fashioned" bugaboos as your child whining, dawdling or, in general, pushing your buttons while they push-

ing the limits.

Perhaps you've searched through your arsenal of child-rearing books for answers. You may have found — a friend of mine swears it's a maxim — that no answer you find is too vague or dogmatic, or your books disagree with one another.

Now here comes "Becoming the Parent You Want to Be; A Sourcebook of Strategies for the First Five Years" (Broadway Books, \$20). Focusing on child behavior and behavior, it has some strengths that fill in where some other books leave off.

The authors are Laura Davis, who co-wrote the bestselling

"Courage to Heal" and mother of a preschooler and an infant, and Janis Keyser, an early-childhood educator and lecturer with children 19, 13 and 9. Both are from Santa Cruz, Calif.

Keyser, in Seattle recently on a book tour, says one way the book is distinctive is that it pays more than lip service to diversity of race, culture and sexual orientation.

The book includes many different parents' voices and approaches, including non-traditional families such as single parents and gay families. (This was a special concern and expertise of the authors, with Davis in a lesbian partnership, though little is made of this in the book, and Keyser having biracial children.)

## Rushdie follows Indian family over 3 generations in 1 of new paperbacks

• "The Moor's Last Sigh," by Salman Rushdie (Vintage, \$13) — Rushdie's richly imagined romance is a generational saga, chronicling the fortunes (and misfortunes) of the eccentric da Gama-Zogbi family over three generations, from the late 1800s to 1993, in modern India. The narrator, Moraes, is the son of the beautiful artist Aurora and her spice merchant husband, Abraham. He also is cursed, moving through time and aging much faster than his family. Rushdie surrounds him with a bevy of colorful characters and gives him fantastic tales to tell, from grand

opera to fairy tale to dark gothic. The language is lush, extravagant, fierce and funny, with a kaledidoscope!

• "Jackson's Dilemma," by Iris Murdoch (Penguin, \$11.95) — The course of true love is an obstacle race in Murdoch's 26th novel, as Marian runs away on her wedding day. She leaves behind an ambiguous note for her fiancé, Edward, much to the chagrin of aging bachelor Benet, a matchmaker who is mistaken about almost everyone's passions and affections, including his own. Meanwhile, Benet's mysterious manservant Jackson watches over all the foolishness with a

wise eye but with his own troubled heart. Murdoch writes with insight and verve although the story veers into melodrama.

• "Last Orders," by Graham Swift (Vintage, \$12) — Winner of Britain's prestigious Booker Prize, Swift's accomplished novel follows four ordinary men — an undertaker, an insurance agent, a car dealer, a produce trader — as they leave a London pub on a pilgrimage to the seaside to scatter the ashes of a fifth man, the butcher Jack Arthur Dodds. Three of the men have known Jack since World War II; the fourth is his foster son. Each, in turn, tells his story as it touched on Jack's, and it is through this chorus that Swift poignantly illuminates ordinary lives.

# Sheppard brings country act to Jackpot

JACKPOT - T. G. Sheppard grew up with a passion for music. He was raised in Humboldt, Tenn., but he ran away to Memphis to sing when he was 15. At first, he sang at parties and clubs with bands. Then, under his given name (Bill Browder), he started his own company and established himself as a full-time record producer for record labels such as RCA.

In 1974, he got his big break when his first single, "Devil in the Bottle," hit number one. 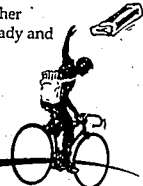

# Stranger's generosity ends couple's vacation nightmare while in Europe

**DEAR ABBY:** You asked for acts of kindness. Well, here is mine:

In June of last year, my husband and I went to Germany and Austria on vacation. While we were in Austria, my husband stumbled and fell, breaking his hip, which required hospitalization and surgery. I remained by his side in the recovery room until I was asked to leave at 1 a.m. I have never felt so alone.

The next morning, the bad luck continued. In my haste to get back to the hospital, I accidentally locked our hotel room key and the car keys in the trunk of our rented car. When I finally located a locksmith, he charged \$103 to unlock the trunk because it was on a Saturday.

My husband spent the next two weeks in the hospital in Salzburg, recovering enough to withstand the 14-hour flight back to our home. When my husband was finally discharged, the hospital demanded payment in cash, as did the ambulance company. The airline also insisted on cash to pay for the upgrade in seats necessary to make my husband comfortable on our flight home. We had prepaid for our vacation and didn't have a great deal of cash with us, so I had to go from bank to bank to get cash advances from our credit cards. It was difficult because on one day the computer would process the transaction, but the next day for some reason, it wouldn't — "trouble on the phone lines," we were told. The language barrier made things doubly difficult.

It was in Frankfurt, Germany, however, where the real trouble occurred. My husband, who was in a wheelchair, had to wait for me around the corner down a long hallway while I tried in vain to pay for the upgrade with our credit cards. I argued, pleaded and begged to see an airline representative or someone from the American Embassy, but the ticket agent wouldn't budge. I feared we were stranded.

As luck would have it, a gentleman standing in the next line turned and asked me what the trouble was.

I told him how we couldn't get home after all the difficulty we'd been through. He opened his wallet, then handed me 50 \$100 bills! My mouth hung open in total shock. He took my name and address, gave me his business card, and went on his way.

Out of possibly 6 billion people on this planet, what were my chances of a Good Samaritan with that much cash standing next to me offering that kind of help? I believe the stranger was an angel in disguise.

**"Dante's Peak"** — Can a bucolic small town in the Pacific Northwest possibly be in danger from a long-dormant volcano? 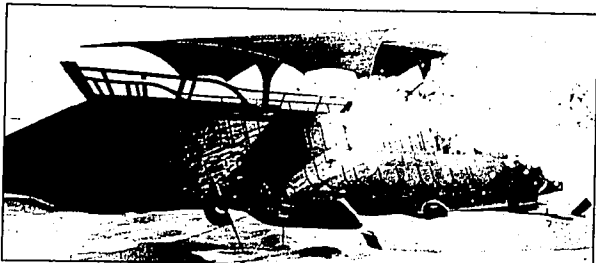

# B.I.G. trouble: Street murders are tearing apart the world of rap

NEW YORK (AP) — When he visits California, rap artist Havoc of Mobb Deep is careful about who is around him. Tension between East and West coast rappers is a reality this Bronx resident can't ignore.

"We're walking targets because we're rappers, we're entertainers. We've got to be careful," said Havoc, whose album, "Hell on Earth," topped the rhythm and blues charts.

The shooting deaths of Tupac Shakur and The Notorious B.I.G. have left many rap musicians on edge.

The two musicians, killed in similar unsolved drive-by shootings six months apart, carried out a personal rivalry in their lyrics and in interviews. Opinions vary as to whether a wider bi-coastal rivalry contributed to real violence in an entertainment form often laced with images of fantasy violence.

"This is the first time I ever felt unsafe," said rapper Ice-T, whose "Cop Killer" song ignited a corporate battle with Time Warner in 1992.

Ice-T and others in the industry sought to calm tensions following the death in Los Angeles Sunday of The Notorious B.I.G., a Brooklyn native whose real name was Christopher Wallace.

Rapper Luke, formerly of 2 Live Crew, also said he is wary.

"It is unsafe for Snoop (Doggy Dogg) to come to a concert in

New York, for Nas to go to a concert in L.A. because there ain't nobody finding these people who are killing everybody," he said. "It is unsafe at this time, I think, for all of us."

Snoop Doggy Dogg is postponing a 38-concert tour that was to begin March 21 in North Carolina

out of respect for his slain friend and because "he doesn't want to be next," a promoter said. When the tour starts in April, security will be a lot tighter and Snoop will be promoting peace and unity, said Jeff Bowen, booking and marketing director at Winston-Salem's coliseum.

# St. Joseph's guards gobble up Pacific

**SALT LAKE CITY** - St. Joseph's renaissance season turned ragged Thursday, but the Hawks had enough savvy - and good fortune - to plow past Pacific, 75-65, in a West Regional opener at the Huntsman Center.

St. Joe's backcourt of Rashid Bey and Arthur Davis supplied the savvy, hitting 15 of 27 shots and scoring 41 points.

Pacific, a school that hadn't been to the NCAA tournament since 1979, supplied the good fortune. The Big West champion shot a miserly 39.3 percent, coughed up 17 turnovers and failed to take advantage of opportunities.

The fourth-seeded Hawks should not expect any such largesse from Boston College, a 73-66 winner over Valparaiso, in a second-round matchup Saturday.

While Davis, a freshman, hinted that St. Joe's problems stemmed from NCAA anxiety, his coach, Phil Martelli suggested otherwise.

Speaking of his two Philadelphia-born guards, Martelli said, "They've played pickup games with some guys there are armed. Pressure in this game? No one had a gun."

The game was not without incident. Reserve St. Joe guard Terrell Myers dropped Pacific's Tim Bowman at mid-court with an elbow to the face in the final 32 seconds of the first half. The foul went uncalled because the two players trailed a fast break that ended with

# Buhl High School track meet kicks off season

**BUHL** - Thursday's track meet at Buhl High School was way ahead of its time - about three or four weeks and 30 degrees Fahrenheit ahead.

"We normally don't run this early," said Buhl coach Tom Chivers. "But we wanted to force the team and the coaches to get focused early. This is a baptism by fire."

An odd cliché, especially at a meet where fans huddled under heavy blankets like litigating couples and hot coffee was a treasured commodity.

"I should have made an industrial-size pot of this stuff," said a member of the Buhl staff over a mug of cappuccino. "I could have made a killing."

Nathaniel Castle of Gooding made a killing in the meet, lapping the latter half of his competition in the 3200-meter run to take first place with a recorded 10:53.

"It was kind of hard with no one there pushing me," Castle said. "But this is only the first meet."

Castle, a junior, said he was just 10 seconds off of his best time from last year in the event. He finished almost half a minute ahead of the second-place finisher and also took top honors in slightly closer 800- and 1600-meter runs.

# Use your head: Don't return too soon after concussion

**ATLANTA** - A second brain concussion shortly after the first can prove fatal, and athletes should not rush back into action after a head injury, the government said Thursday.

"We simply don't know how many young athletes are returned to play without a proper evaluation," said Dr. David Thurman, an epidemiologist with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

About 100,000 football players suffer head injuries each year, said Dr. James Kelly and Dr. Jay Rosenberg, whose guidelines for diagnosis and treatment of concussions in sports were issued by the American Academy of Neurology and appeared earlier this week in the journal Neurology.

Thurman estimated sports-related head injuries at 300,000 a year.

"We're trying to see that more attention is paid to this so young athletes are not sent back in when they should be recovering from an injury," he said.

Beiford, a coach, said field hockey and wrestling are sports in which head injuries are common.

### Symptoms of concussions

- **Early symptoms:** dizziness, headache, lack of awareness of surroundings, nausea and vomiting.
- **Later symptoms (days or weeks):** persistent low-grade headache, light-headedness, poor attention and concentration, responses, inability to focus attention, blurred or incoherent speech, loss of coordination, overly emotional, forgetfulness, loss of consciousness.
- **Frequently observed symptoms:** racing heart, delayed verbal or motor responses, inability to focus attention, blurred or incoherent speech, loss of coordination, overly emotional, forgetfulness, loss of consciousness.

Not all concussions cause loss of consciousness. Thurman cited the case of a 17-year-old high school football player who injured his head and told a team-

mate, but not his coach.

The player returned to the game but collapsed on the field after several blows to the head during routine blocks and tackles. His brain swelled, and he died four days later.

An athlete who loses consciousness momentarily should not compete again for at least a week, and one who remains unconscious for several minutes should stay on the sidelines for two weeks or more, Thurman said.

If an athlete is knocked unconscious a second time, regardless of how long after the first time, he should stay out at least a month, he said.

Trainers must assess any athlete who might have a head injury, and an athlete who seems confused, dizzy or unsteady must be examined by a physician, Thurman said. If the problem doesn't clear up within 15 minutes, the athlete should not be allowed back in the game.

Asking an athlete if he remembers his name or the day of the week is not good enough, Thurman said.

"The athlete should be asked to remember a list of three objects, then asked five

minutes later what the objects were."

People with brain injuries may be able to answer rote questions but will have more difficulty if they are required to memorize or calculate, he said.

Coaches and trainers who allow athletes to return to the field might not do so if they knew how dangerous it was, Thurman said.

"If they occur too close together, brain injuries can have a devastating effect. Even if they are spaced out, they can have a cumulative effect."

If tests reveal brain swelling or brain contusions, an athlete should be discouraged from participating in contact sports, the guidelines say.

Mike O'Brien, football coach at Valdosta High School in Georgia, said doctors are on the sidelines at every game and at most practices.

"What we try to impress upon our kids is that if you are hurt, you go see the doctor or trainer," O'Brien said.

Thurman said the CDC will be working with the states that survey head injuries most thoroughly to determine how common second-impact injury is.

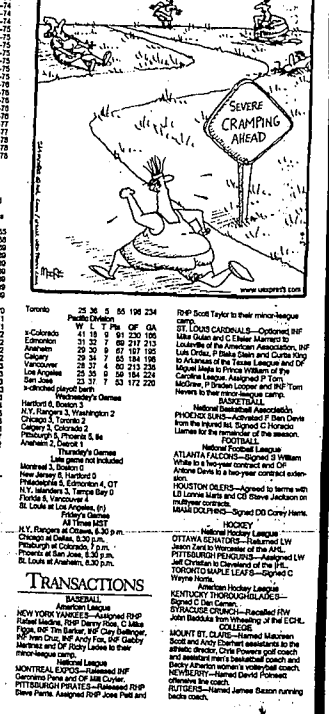

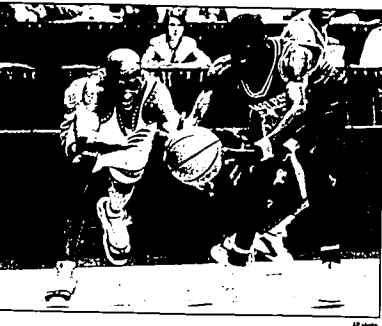

## American consumers spent freely in February, fanning inflation fears

WASHINGTON — Debt-burdened American consumers spent freely last month, increasing the chances the Federal Reserve will push interest rates higher to forestall inflation.

And America's trade deficit soared to its second-worst performance ever last year.

A grab bag of reports, issued Thursday by government agencies and a trade association, on the whole depict a robust economy maintaining its momentum into the spring, analysts said.

A pair of monetary tightening pushed up interest rates in bond markets, sent stock prices lower, with the Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks losing more than 100 points by mid-afternoon.

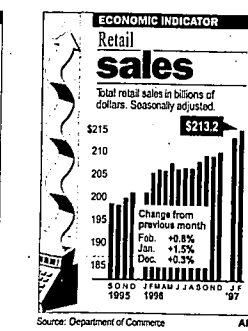
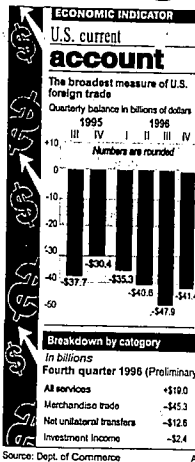
Retail sales rose a strong 0.8 percent to a seasonally adjusted \$213.2 billion in February after shooting up 1.5 percent in January, the Commerce Department said. The January figure more than doubled an earlier estimate of a 0.6 percent gain.

Both department stores and auto dealers reported strong gains in February.

Consumer confidence is high, analysts said, because of a vibrant job market. The Labor Department said new claims for unemployment benefits fell by 5,000 last week to 300, the lowest level in more than two years. The four-week moving average of claims, at 310,250, was the lowest since 1989.

Ironically, America's vigor, relative to its European trading partners and Japan, contributed to a sharp deterioration last year in the nation's current-account deficit, the broadest measure of U.S. foreign trade.

Consumer demand in the United States fueled import growth while lackluster



in addition to trade in goods and services.

Consumers' buying binge came even though the percentage of Americans falling behind on their credit card bills jumped at the end of 1996 to the highest level on record.

The American Bankers Association said credit card delinquencies climbed in the fourth quarter to a record 3.72 percent of all accounts up from 3.48 percent in the third quarter.

And the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. said earnings of the nation's 525 commercial banks hit an all-time high of \$52.4 billion last year, up 7.5 percent from 1995. Savings investment earnings slipped 79 percent to \$7 billion. The combined total of bank and S&I failures — six — was the lowest in 24 years.

## Dow nose-dives more than 160 points as worries mount

NEW YORK — The Dow Jones industrial average tumbled Thursday to its fifth-biggest point drop ever as inflation and interest rate worries intensified, triggering a broad sell-off in the stock market.

The Dow lost 160.48 points, or 2.28 percent, closing at 6,978.89. The blue-chip barometer's plunge was led by Philip Morris, which slid the equivalent of 37 Dow points amid renewed worries about health-ability suits against the tobacco industry.

Even so, the Dow's drop was hardly the work of an isolated few. The Dow's 30 components, only AT&T showed a gain for the day. Similarly, broad stock measures also fell sharply, with the Standard & Poor's 500 list losing about 1.8 percent.

The session represented a broad sweep-out setback which reflects a general desire to lighten up on equity exposure," said Michael Metz, vice president at Oppenheimer & Co., asserting that much of the market's record-setting rise has been the product of momentum investing, which emphasizes trading patterns over economic trends or a company's financial performance. "Now you have the momentum craze working in reverse."

Stocks were pressured from the open by the bond market, where interest rates jumped toward a six-month high amid news of surprisingly heavy retail activity during January and February.

The Commerce Department reported that retail sales rose 0.8 percent in February, which was slightly higher than expected. Last month's initial estimate of January's increase, meanwhile, was revised sharply from 0.6 percent to 1.5 percent.

The robust retail sales report compounded

growing fears that the Federal Reserve will soon raise interest rates to slow borrowing and spending as protection against inflationary demand. A sharp rise in retail sales, which represent about one-third of the nation's economic activity, might aggravate inflationary pressures such as rising production costs.

In a separate report Thursday morning, the Labor Department said new claims for jobs benefits fell by 5,000 last week to the lowest level in more than two years, reflecting a tightening labor market that could force wages — and consumer prices — higher.

As bond prices fell Thursday, the yield on the 30-year Treasury bond — a key determinant of corporate and consumer borrowing costs — rose from late Wednesday's 6.88 percent to nearly 6.98 percent before settling at about 6.96 percent. The yield hasn't been above 7 percent since September.

The long bond is knocking up against 7 percent, which means that the stock market is looking rather severely overvalued," said Metz. "A risk-free return of 7 percent (on Treasury bonds) is beginning to look rather attractive, and it's no indication that this is the peak for rates."

Declining issues outnumbered advances by nearly a 4-to-1 margin on the New York Stock Exchange, where volume totaled 243.7 million shares in a p.m., up from 483.2 million on Wednesday.

Fixer issued for browser's security flaws

SEATTLE (AP) - Microsoft has posted a single patch, or program repair kit, to fix all three security bugs found over the past week in its Internet Explorer Web browser.

Without the patch, an unscrupulous Web site operator could take advantage of the flaws to wreak havoc in someone else's computer, sending instructions to run programs secretly, send electronic mail under the operator's name, or harden software stored on a hard drive.

The patch was posted late Saturday at the Microsoft Corp. official Web site and can be downloaded for free. The flaws affect Internet Explorer versions 3.0 and 3.01 for the Windows 95 and Windows NT 4.0 operating systems.

Internet Explorer claims about 25 percent to 30 percent of the market for programs to browse the World Wide Web on the Internet.

The first flaw was found more than a week ago by a student at Worcester Polytechnic Institute in Worcester, Mass. Another one was discovered Thursday by a student at the University of Maryland in College Park, Md.

The third problem was reported Friday by students at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Microsoft's repair efforts should avert any significant damage to the company's effort to catch up with Netscape, the leading Web browser, said Dan Kuznetzky, director of the client server environments program at International Data Corp. in Framingham, Mass.

He and David Fester, product manager for the Internet platforms division at Microsoft headquarters in Redmond, noted that bugs also have been found in Netscape browsers.

"Clearly, it means that the industry needs to come together to better address this sort of problem - these security concerns," Fester said.

Katherine Kelly Lang (Brooke Logan Forrester Chambers), Ronn Moss (Ridge Forrester) and John McCook (Eric Forrester). Over the past decade, the series has grown to become one of the more popular daytime shows both in the United States and abroad.

McCook, who had originated the role of Lance Prentiss on "Y&R" several years earlier, recalls, "When we came on, we were this small boutique soap opera. But the show has grown over the years. Nothing mercurial. Just a fine, steady upward pace. And it's been a rewarding experience to be part of it."

Asked what surprised him most about the show over the past 10 years, John said, "How popular we've become around the world. We're in some 90 countries, and the appeal of the show in those places is truly phenomenal."

McCook started his show business career in musicals. His rich baritone voice earned him roles in productions such as "Showboat,"

"Carousel," "Man of La Mancha," and "From the Top" with Carol Burnett. He is also a pianist and conductor.

"Music remains the constant in my life," McCook says. "I've been doing this show for 10 years — enjoying every moment. But I've been involved with music for 30 years."

A critic once said that Sigmund Romberg's operettas were actually soap

operas set to music.

McCook chuckled. "You could say that about Bizet, too," he said. "Carmen definitely has all the elements of a soap opera."

"And daytime dramas certainly have an embarrassment of emotions," McCook added. "Every day, so many major things happen to the characters. So, yes, any soap would be a perfect venue for someone to compose music to. I guess that's what melodrama means."

Speaking of soap themes like love, romance, passion, lust, and all those other good things, how is that Eric Forrester can be involved with so many women, and no one takes him to task for all that bedding, wedding, wooing and pursuing?

"Because he's so sincere," McCook said. "Eric may be the elder statesman, but he has more ex-wives than anyone on the show, and can one in and out of relationships more often than the young people on the soap. I feel it has to do with his sincerity. He sincerely wishes to have a really wonderful, fulfilling relationship, as opposed to a young stud of a boy who is looking just to score."
