Pickets go up as Teamsters strike

WASHINGTON — The Teamsters union struck United Parcel Service early Monday after talks with the nation's largest package delivery service broke down over issues ranging from part-time

largest package delivery service proxe-down over issues ranging from part-time, work to pensions.

"We have exhausted every possible approach to try to re-silve the problem." Feamsters President Rot Carey declared as he left the bargaining table late Sunday night. "At this point it's just a waste of time."

BoSTON — To a teen ager, watchful parents can seem an awful lot like Biz Brother.

The software, called NetSnitch, is being pitched as a tool for parents who don't want to centor their kids. Unlike other het minders, which block children from visiting sites deemed too racy or violent, NetSnitch just records where they've been and how long they've been there.

TWIN FALLS – Patrolling on bicycles with Twin Falls police is akin to submarining. Silent, unobtrosive, patient. And efficient.

Tonight, Twin Falls police Cpl. Steve Benkula and his partner, Patrolman Jim Tuttle, are riding under a full moon and falling stars. They're looking for juveniles on the street after curfew, specifically repeat offenders.

They wear short-sleeved dark blue summer patrol shirts, dark shorts, dark blue helmets, and look like shadows. The only sound they make is the quiet tick-tickick of the bikes freewheel gears, and the pap of sugged gears and the rape of sugged gears and the pap of sugged gears with the paper of the paper o

"We can take that," Benkula says, shifting gears and turning from North Sixth Avenue onto North Fifth Avenue. "I like that call," Tuttle says with a grin.

Proposal aims to remove games from government computers

WASHINGTON — Nothing would make a taxpayer angrier than the thought of a federal bureaucrat playing computer solitaire on government time. Now, Congress is poised to minimize that ugly possibility. But the cure may prove more costly than the problem, industry experts warn.

Compress to passe to pass legislation this fall forcing the removal of games from more than a million federally contend comments, and bloeking, practicases of new computers that have games built in.





American soldiers' remains from Korean War to be returned today

SEOUI, South Korea (AP) — The remains of several American soldiers killed nearly 47 years ago in the Korean War are scheduled to be returned from North Korea today, a U.S. official said.

The United States was given access to North lorea, a reclusive communist nation, a year and Korea, a reclusive communist nation, a year and a half ago.
"My indication is that we're going to get multiple sets of remains, four or five," J. Alan Liotto,

a Defense Department official, said Sunday.
The remains are to be returned in a ceremony at Pannunjom, a neutral village in the demilitarized zone that has separated North and South Korea since their three-year war ended in 1953.





SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A federal appeals court on Sunday blocked the execution of man for a 1981 rape and murder, saying his lawyer's incompetence raised a "grave question" about his guilt.

Thomas Martin Thompson, 42, was scheduled to be executed Tuesday by injection at San Quantin

In its 7-4 decision, the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals threw out Thomgson's rape conviction and death sentence by overturning an earlier ruling by its own 3 judge panel. The rape conviction was a "special circumstance" that enabled him to sentenced to death

"The consequence of our failure to act would be the execution of a person as to whom a grave question exists whether he is innocent of the death-qualifying offense, the alleged rape, and whose conviction on the first-degree murder charge may be fundamentally flawed." Judge Betty Fletcher wrote.



Congress should hold DOE's feet to the fire on Pit 9

From the Idaho Statesman, Boise

Not a speck, not a grain. That's how much dirt has been cleaned up in one of the Gem State's most solled spots. The failure of the U.S. Department of Energy to effectively deal with a one-acre plutonium dump called Pit 9 at the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory is an outrageous waste of taxpayers' time and money.

Gov. Phil Batt deserves strong support for insisting that DOE fulfill its prumise to clean up the site. Idaho has given the federal agency a Sept. 30 deadline to submit a revised cleanup lan and schedule.

Congress also should hold DOE's feet to the fire.

American taxpayers cannot be expected to endlessly supply millions of dollars without positive assurance that the job will be done right – and done on time.

The cleanup at Pit 9 is critically important to the future of Idaho. The site is located above the Snake River aquifer, which supplies groundwater to much of southern Idaho. Pit 9 contains materials that will remain radioactive for tens of thousands of years.

The possibility that dangerous ra-

years.

The possibility that dangerous ra-dioactivity eventually will find its way

into the aquifer, affecting future generations of Idahoans, cannot be ignored, especially when millions of dollars are at stake today. Plutonium can be deadly when ingested or inhaled. When DOE first handed over the cleanup project to a private contractor, Lockheed Martin, Advanced Environmental Systems, the cost was fixed at \$179 million. Three years later, the Pit 9 project is expected to cost \$492 million – and the cleanup hasn't even started.

started.

An unfortunate side effect of this ex-perience is that it may jeopardize fu-ture attempts to privatize government

functions.

That would be a mistake.

And that's why it is so important for Congress to get to the bottom of this

Congress to get to the bottom of this cleanup fiace.

The mistakes made this time can be studied and used as guidelines to ensure they don't happen again.

More important, however, is the ability of DOE to prove it is capable of meeting its obligations to all Americans.

DOE has several important deadlines looming in the months ahead regarding the safe and effective disposal
of the nation's nuclear waste.

With its credibility shaky at best,
the agency cannot afford to go back on
yet another promise.

"Use human means as though divine ones did not exist, and use divine means as though there were no human ones. These profound words, published three hundred years ago in a "timeless wisdom book," were drawn from "The Art of Worldly Wisdom: A Pocket Oracle," by Baltasst Grand.

Worldly Wisdom: A Pocket Oracle," by Baltasar Gracian.
Until recently, when Gracian's works were translated from Spanish to English by Christopher Mauer and published by Dubleday, he 17th century Jesuit scholar's astonishing classic has been largely unavailable to modern readers.
Says Mauer. "The 'Oracle' has been spoken in many fongues, has been heard with admiration and greeted with praise. It was simitated by La Rocheforousald. "walued by writers as diverse as Joseph Addison and Fredrich Niershe, and lovingly translated into German by Arthur Schopenhauser," who believed the "Oracle" was "absolutely unique."

Despite Gracian's enduring acclaim, as a moralist, his writings were viewed with ani-mosity by his superiors and he was repeat-edly warned not to publish his works with-

"Not that his writings were regarded as heretical," Mauer explained. Rather, "It was somewhat unseemly for a Jesuit priest to write so brilliantly on worldly wisdom and on political behavior. Blinded by the light

Save your skin, but your eyes may be at greater risk

We've all heard the warnings about the we've all heard the warmings about us sun and our skin — you go out, you spent too much time in the sun without protection and you get burned. Down the roac you might get skin cancer because of it.

But now doctors also are focusing on
the severe eye damage that can result
from long-term exposure to the sun.

"If you only had 8 or 10 years where you could protect yourself, you'd be better off doing it early rather than late," Cibis said.



One is the UV rating, All sunglasses should block 99 to 100 percent of UVA and UVB radiation, Fiol Silva said. The UV rating should be listed on a sicker of tag attached to the glasses.

MONROVIA, Liberia (AP) — The macabre annals of Liberia's civil war include gunmen in drag, human skulls used as soccer balls and the videotaped forture of the ousted president. But nothing compares to the tale of Gen. Butt Naked.

Nude except for lace-up leather shoes and a gun, the general led his fierce Butt Naked Bartalion into battle on behalf of the warlord Roosevelt Johnson, who hired the unclothed warrior for his fear-lessness and fighting skills.

As the war wound down, so too did Gen. Butt Naked's commitment to kill. Today, but we have a support of the state of


