Norco plant will close; move affects 100 workers

TWIN FALLS - About 100 employees of the Norco window plant won't have a job in Twin Falls in the next 60 days. As workers heard that announcement Friday, plant owners also opened a window of hope.

No-one willing to rolocate to other company locations will be terminated, says Bob Kingzett, spokesman for Jeld-Wen Inc. of Klamath Falls, Ore. The company is closing the local operation to consolidate window and patio door production at its main manufacturing plant in Hawkins, Wis.

Falls Area Chamber of Commerce execu-tive director, but he said the company was good while it lasted, and marked the beginning of Twin Falls' economic resur-

gence.
"We had 10 years of it in there, averaging over 100 jobs. That's a nice investment for the community," he said.
Kingzett said the closure will affect more than 100 people, but wouldn't disclose an exact number. A few "sales-oriented" staffers will remain but he didn't

Kingzett said he didn't know what would happen to the property and wasn't "privy to say" what led to the decision to move operations to Wisconsin. He did say he was not aware of any other pending closures within the company.

In Judy 1995, TJ International Inc. of Boics sold its Norro Window division to Jeld-Wen for about \$30 million. At the time, Norco employed 600 workers ar plants in Twin Falls, Hawkins and Marenisco, Mich.

TWIN FALLS – A creditor wants money, so land for a controversial hydroelectric development at Auger Falls is set to be sold at auction on the steps of the county courtbouse.

The sheriff's sale is scheduled for 10 a.m. Sept. Do Bidmen also gets Cogeneration Inc.'s \$1.2 million mortpage for the land.

The auction of roughly 500 acres was forced by Cogeneration's No. 2 creditor – J-UB Engineers – which has an uncollected judgment of more than \$272,000. The top creditor is Rock Creek Joint Ventures, which sold the land to Cogeneration. Non-public school tax credit wins OK

BOISE — Attorney General Alan Lance said it likely would be constitutional to grant a state income tax credit to parents of children who comply with Idaho's compulsory celucation law without using public schools.

In an eight-page opinion issued Friday, Lance said there appeared to be no constitutional prohibition against such a tax credit, which was considered by the Legislature last winter and is expected to emerge again in 1998 each of the Critics of the Cri

in or religious purpose.

I Lance said miske a tax credit for rivate school tution, which might be unconstitutional, claiming the proposed credit would not require payment of money to a private or churchaffiliated school.

"The benefit flows to the taxpayer/parent, not to the school," he wrote in the opinion requirested by Republican state Reps. Dave Bivens of Meridian and Jim Kempton of Albion.

"In the case of a tuition tax credit for nonuse flowers and pay tuition to private schools may claim it. A tax credit for nonuse fift parachia schools."

In fact, Lance said, the proposal "provides a benefit to parents for the stated purpose of relieving the burden on the state's public school system."

Clinton faces sex harassment trial in May

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Paula Corbin Jones's sexual harassment lawsuit against President Clinton can go forward, a federal judge ruled Friday.

She rejected attempts by defense lawyers to have the case thrown out. U.S. District Court Judge Susan Webber Wright did dismiss the 'allegation that Clinton had defamed Mrs. Jones and dismissed a claim that the former state employee had been denied due process.

"I'm just glad it's going to proceed and go forward," said Mrs. Jones, who flew in from her California home to watch the hearing.

The judge set jury selection for May 27 and said she hoped the case could be tried in about a week. Lawyers had esti-



mated four weeks.

"I would hope we could try this case in five or six days — it doesn't look like a case that's worth anything more than that," she said.







The effort has been stalled for two years because of disagreement between Clinton and Republican supporters over how to deal with labor and environmental issues.



A new shipment of beef from a Weizer distributor arrived around 2:30 Pum. Friday, said Debib Olpin, managing director of the restaurants in Burley. Twin Falls and Wells, Nev.

She said the local Burger Kings stopped serving hamburgers Thursday evening when they were told the meat might be contaminated by the E. coli

The possible E. coli-related sickness of an Oakley girl and death of another were not attributable to the Burger King meat, according to the grandfather of one of the children, John Berglund. He said his family had not been at a fast-food restaurant for more than a week before 2-year-old Maddison Lloyd became ill, and rarely went to Burger King anyway.

in a Salt Lake City hospital.

Ham-and-cheese and BLT sandwiches replaced Whoppers at Burger Kinga around the nation as the largest meat recall in U.S. history sent the fast-food chain scrambling for new beef suppliers.

Burger King, the nation's second-largest fast-food chain behind McDonald's, came up beef short after it cleared its stores of patties supplied by Hudson Foods Inc., the source of burgers blamed in an E. coil outbreak that sickened fewer than two dozen people

in Colorado in early June.

Miami-based Burger King said 1,650 of its restaurants in 28 states were affected by the recall Thursday of 25 million pounds of hamburger processed at a Hudson Foods plant in Columbus, Neb., but 950 of the restaurants got new beef supplies by Friday, Other Burger Kings in the chain didn't use Hudson as a symbler.

burned. Most of the blazes were caused by lightning, lack of moisture and an abundance of dry tinder.

So far this year in Utah, though, 547 fires have charred only 23,176 acrey according to the Eastern Great Basin Coordination Center, Still, that is mowhere near the 1975 record of just 1,522 acres burned.

burned. The scorched acreage this summer is slightly higher in Idaho — 23,976 acres burned by 622 fires, the Interagency Fire Centers reports. But that pales in comparison to the estimated 750,000 acres ravaged in more than 400 wildfires last year. And the Idaho blazes created serious post-fire problems. The worst showed up in Boise's foothills, where flames stripped

away regetation and left a serious mud slide threat. More than \$13 million was quickly spent to curtail that crisis. Fewer big fires this summer also has meant firefighting agencies are not having to dip into their emergency funds so exten-sively.

sively.

Last year's Utah fires cost about \$34 million, and Idaho's also soured well into the millions.

Air bag death brings suit

BOISE (AP)—The mother of a I-year-old girl who was decapitated by an air bag which deployed in a slow-speed collision sued Volkswagen Friday, alleging the German automaker manufactured a defective product.
Alexandra Greer died Nov. 26, 1996, when the 1995 Jetat that Autumn Rebecca Blackman was driving collided with another car in a Boise shopping center. The impact deployed both side air bags at a force of 200 mph. The infant was in a forward-facing child seat.

The lawsuit was filed in 4th District Court in Beise against Volkswagen of America, Inc., and the Ada County woman driving the other car. Blackman asks for unspecified damages.

"We alleged in this case that the Jeria was defective and unreasonably dangerous," said Alan Morton, Blackman's attorney.

He said it was the first time Blackman ever drove the car, which was her sister's, and Blackman also suffered back and

Blackman also suffered back and neck injuries.

She insists the seat belt was fastened down on the child seat during the accident and she unbuckled it afterwards.

But a preliminary report by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration in May concluded the child safety seat was not secured to the front seat. The child seat pivoted forward against the air bag cover as it deployed.

"I don't want this case to be a seat belt case; it's an air bag case." Morton said.

Notch Butte has warm vents all over it, covered with orange-colored mossy lichen in fall - olive green with orange in spring. If one looks closely, dark cross call breather warm air. When conditions are just right, seam can be seen rising from the vents.
Once in 1994, an enormous column of steam was vented under a great deal of pressure. It was

like steam from a petcock on a pressure cooker about to explode, but it was hundreds of thousands of times bigger than that tiny column of pressured steam.

In late winter 1995, docens of columns of steam were seven rising in tall columnar clouds, warring with the wind and drifting of to the horsheast - this time, like the pressure of steam from spouts of giant, simmering teapors.

Occasionally, clouds form ower North Butte. There is not a connecting column of steam, but the same altitude clouds form and drift away.





Utah firm's ZipPlus to be out by Christmas

ROY, Utah (AP) — Iomega Corp. is counting on a new enhanced version of its popular "Zipbrand diard storage drives to spell profits during the coming Christmas shopping season. The northern Utah company, which has sold millions of the 100-megabyte capacity drives in the last few years, announced it will begin selling the new ZipPlus drives during the fourth quarter.

ZipPlus drives during the fourth quarter.

At \$199.95, the new unit will cost more than the original Zip drive (now \$149.95), but the ZipPlus will ofter additional software and features requested by users, said Anne Haggar, lomega's senior marketing manager.

"Zip is one of the most popular, fastest growing products in consumer electronics history, Ilaggar said. "But a significant portion of customers were willing

to pay a higher price for additional features."

Itaggar said the new drive will be "made" first in the United States, with production eventually shifting to lomega's Malaysia facility: However, she expected the Roy plant to remain key to production.







Dad called the other day. He was look-ing for his trombone, and he wanted to now if I had seen it.

"Dad," I said, "I don't remember ever aving seen your trombone."

"Sure you have," my 87-year-old father said. "I used to play in Charlie Perkins' orchestra. And I played in the high school band. I was pretty darn good at it, too."

"I'm sure you were," I said. "But that was 70 years ago, and as far as I know, you haven't had a trombone since then. We probably have a better chance of finding Amelia Earhart."

"Oh, so you think Mary Hart has it?"

I was about to make a joke about Mary Hart not being interested in music ever since John Tesh was her co-host on

Entertainment Tonight," but I thought etter of it.

"No, Dad," I said. "Amelia Earhart, not Mary Hart."

"Why would Amelia Earhart have my trombone?"

"She doesn't," I said. "I was just making a joke."

"Oh," he said. Then he forced a chuck-le. Maybe he got it, maybe he didn't.

These days, we're never quite sure how much Dad understands of what is going on a round him. Some days, he seems like the same bright, witry man I grew up admiring and wanting to emu-late. Other days – like the day he asked me who my mother was – he seems like a stranger living in Dad's skin.

"So," he said, "you haven't seen my trombone?"

"No, Dad. I'm sorry. I haven't." "Will you help me look for it?"

"Sure - I'll keep an eye out for it."

"And you'll let me know if you find it?"

"l'll let you know," I said.

Then my curiosity got the best of me and I asked him, "What will you do with it if you find it?"

He hesitated only a moment. "Well, he said, "I'll blow it, I guess."

That's my dad - practical, sensible, down-to-earth. At least that much about him hasn't changed over the years. But other things about him - and my relationship to him - are changing - almost daily.

almost daily.

In many respects, it seems as though our roles have reversed. He used to call to check on me, now I call to check on him. He used to get after me for taking off without letting anyone know where I was going; now I get after him for taking off without letting anyone know where he is going, He used to hide the car keys from me, now I hide the car keys from me, now I hide the car keys from him (not that that's an especially difficult task, as much as he forgets things these days. Dad could pretty much hide the car keys from himself.).

But no matter how difficult things may be between us, it isn't really a stranger living in Dad's skin. It's Dad. He has entered a new plase of his life, one that none of us anticipated or prepared for. He isn't the strong, dynamic, liery family leader he once was. The days of going to him for counsel or money are gone.

money are gone.

But that doesn't make him any less valuable to our family, or any less loved. He's still Dad. And just as he cared for us and about us when we were weak, unpredictable and unable to make clear, well-reasoned decisions for ourselves (you know - like when we were teen-agers), we need to care for him now. We need to herish him. We need to treasure him. But more than anything else, we need to be there for him.

Even if we have no idea where to find his trombone.



Bosnian Serb military warns elected leader against dividing territory

wartime leader Radovan Karadzic on

President Biljana Plavsic's northern
headquarters in Banja Luka and
Karadzic's stronghold of Pale threatens
to provoke violence between Bosnian
Serbs.

With increasing support from the West, Plavsic is campaigning to discredit Karneltic and his allies in the eyes of Bosnian Serbs, accusing the wartime leaders of impoverishing their people

through corruption and black-market deals. Plavsic has dismissed the Kanadic-dominated Bosnian Serb assembly, and is hoping for October elections to elect a new one.

The military commanders' warning came after a reported meeting with Kanadic allies in the northeastern town of Biglijna, who claimed that Plavsic was trying to split the Serb state in two. "Il individual actors in the crisis should continue to destabilize and destroy the state, the army of the Serb Republic shall ... undertake measures to defend integrity, sovereignty and the constitutional order," the commanders said in a statement, according to the state news agency, SRNA. Still, it was not clear if all Serb military leaders were behind the statement. The pro-Karadic state media said the reported meeting included generals known to be loyal to Plavsic, who seemed unlikely to back it.

The Bosnian Serb army also accused

the NATO-led peace force in Bosnia of setting a "dangerous precedent" by taking sides in a political dispute. Hundreds of peace force soldiers moved Wednesday to prevent an alleged coup against Plavis Last week, saying she did not have the power to dismiss the assembly, but Plavis: and her international backers claim those judges were intimidated.

Top Western officials in Bosnia tried to silence the angry rhetoric, insisting the would not tolerate "a descent into violence."

Shouting threats, 100 Serbs blocked the road to the village for hours before being dispersed by soldiers from the MATO-lee peace force, said U.N. spokes. The military may be one of the last tools Karadzic's supporters have against Plasvic, but it is unclear how much it can do.




