BURLEY - Sundance Ag Inc. might have to pay more than \$300,000 in proposed penalties over job safety violations that contributed to an April 3 explosion that killed one man.

The U.S. Labor Department's Occupational Safety and Health Administration announced Thursday it had levied more than 30 different citations at the Burley metam sodium plant. The proposed fines total \$330,400, the

second-highest OSHA penalty in Idaho history.

Eight citations are for violations described as "willful." This means the employer knew conditions were a viola-tion or hazardous, but made no reason-able effort to correct them.

Among these violations is an allega-tion that a manhole cover for the 28,000-gallon day tank was installed with bolts missing, creating a loose seal allowing

Combustible fumigant to escape, mossibly causing the explosion.

Barday Mechanical Service Inc., the construction company contracted to-do-work at the plant the day of the explosion, "had no knowledge there was anything other than water in the tank," said Ryan Kuehmichel, OSHA area-director in Boise.

A spokesperson for the construction company said it had not been informed





## Death penalty use hits <u>high</u>

WASHINGTON (AP) — Execution's at U.S. prisons have reached a 40-year high this year, with 57 convicted murderers put to death and three months to go. Dwight Dwayne Adanandus' execution by injection Wednesday in Teans brought the nationwide yearly total to its highest level since 1957, when 65 people were subjected to capital punshment. This year's total could surpass the 1957 number if executions continue at the current pace aided by streamlined appeal processes in federal courts and some state courts.

"There are going to be more executions in the future as these cases get speeded up" as a result of federal and state laws shortening the appeal process, said Richard Dieter of the Death Penalty Information Center, a Washington-based group that is concerned with what it says are inequitities in how the death—penalty is applied.

Forty-five people were executed nationwide last year and 56 in 1995. The most executions in any of the previous 18 years was 38 in 1993.

The large number of executions in Texas this year is parily due to a backlog of cases from 1996, when executions were virtually halted during a court challenge to a new state law aimed at speeding up appeals. Texas had 19 executions in 1995 and three last year. Executions resumed early this year after the new law was upheld by a state appeals court.



And they are advising hunters with the upcoming waterfood sea-on to watch out for their dogs.

The outbreak of avian bogulism was discovered last week when, dead ducks begin appearing on the upper end of the reservoir, biologist Carl, Anderson said Thursday.

"This is a very potent toxin,"
Anderson said, "And there are
thousands of ducks out there."
A large number of dead ducks
also were discovered found on
the Fort Hall Indian Reservation.
The birds will begin to show
symptoms soon after contracting
the toxin which is smill are bottom
than in spoiled food. The avian
strain is not lethal to humans;
however.

"According to our scientists, a human would have to eat 200 pounds of meat before feeling any effects," Anderson said. The

toxin occurs naturally in borner sediments in stagment water, spurred on by warm weather. ### Team still trying to talk to Pathfinder

PASADENA, Calif. (AP)—
The Mare Pathfinder is still operating, but NASA is struggling to find ways to communicate with the spaceship that has now outlied its original minimum design life by nearly two months.
It's possible its hattery is dead and solar energy will have to be used in the future, scientists said Thursday.
After three days of problems communicating with the space-craft, controllers were able to re-establish enough contact with the lander through an auxiliary transmitter to determine it's still operational. NASA said Wednesday.

Wednesday. Another, similar signal was received Thursday, but again no data was transmitted, Project Manager Brian Muirhead said. He likened the signal to being waved at by Pathfinder when scientists really want it to talk to them.

Muirhead sounded more certain that the lander's battery had finally died, which would mean that using the spacecraft would require devising new ways to control Pathfinder during periods when its solar panels are generating enough power.
