



LOS ANCELES (AP) — Science may not be much help proving the case against a hospital worker who admitted sufficating or finally drugging up to 50 terminally ill patients, as expert said Sunday. Those methods of killing can leave few signs to show up in an autopsy. If the bodies are enhumed.

"It's going to be very difficult," said Dr. Cyril Wecht, a nationally known forensics pathologist who serves as a county medical examiner in Pittsburgh. 1.
He suggested that authorities should take their time and be "very selective" about which body to die un.

"If you're going to nail this guy, and make sure he's not a kook or a nut or something, one case against him is as good as 50," said Wecht, who has been involved in cases like the JonBener Ramsey slaying and became famous for disputing the single-bullet theory in the assassination of President Kennedy.

WASHINGTON — Despite election-year pressures, looming budget surpluses and GOP promises of tax reductions as far as the eye can see, many Republicans in Congress are doing a remarkable thing: They are curbing their appetite for tax cuts.

The Senate this week is alared to vote on a budger that calls for setting aside \$157 billion in projected surpluses over the next five years instead of using the windfall to trin taxes. The budger provides only \$50 billion for tax can be supply to the surplus of the surplus o

"Given the desires on the part of both sides of the aisle to increase spending or cut taxes, this is not such a bad place to be," said Susan Tanaka, vice president of the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, a nonpertieun group.





Owner reclaims dog rescued from mountains'

SALTLAKE CITY (AP)—The owner of a yellow Labrador retriever rescued from south-water of the retriever rescued from south-waters under retriever has given up the animal to one of her benefactors.

However, Joy Caddell, of Beaver, retains the right to visit the dog —known to her as "Saickers" — at the dog's new home with Salt Lake skier Marshall Denton.

"We had her for 11 great years and now she can shed some light with him," Gaddell said. "I'm just happy she's alive."

The dog, minus a broken leg that veterinarians were forced to amputate, had been renamed Tushar' by Denton and other rescuers who found the 55-pound animal near death and packed her out to safety.

On Saturday, a relieved Caddell initially laid claim to the dog, which had disappeared from home during a snowstorm on Feb. 19, she said.

"We have other animals, but Snickers and our German shepherd are more like family members," said Caddell, whose family moved from California to

Utah several weeks before Soickers wandered off.
On March 21, three Salt Lake City men sking the high east peaks of the Tushurs found the emicated and hobbled dog in a rocky outcrop at 11,000 feer disappeared fire weeks before. The trio packed the dog down the mountain and brought her to University Pet Clinic in Salt Lake City. Veterinarians amputated the dog's twice-fractured front leg, and performed other lifesawing procedures.





concentration or less are the realm of cosmerics. At higher concentrations, increased hyper-pigmentation (developing durier hyper) igneration (developing white or lighter areas of skin) is a risk, especially for darker skin tones.
